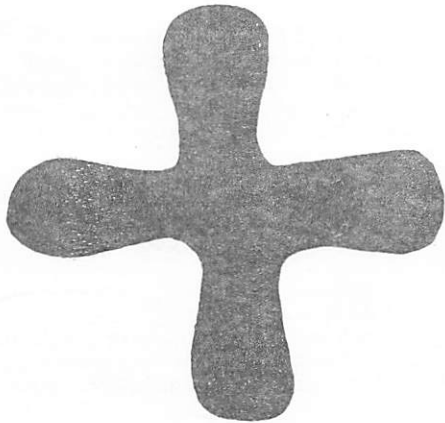


GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

WEEK TEN

JUNE 6-JUNE 12, 1977



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Lord Mayor of London tours Isle of Dogs with Rolls Royce, chaplain, sheriff and alderman; is impacted by Island leadership. Schedules two more TM core meetings, one more set up. Clergy collegium during day intensifies regional movement network development.

Internal: Reflection on campaign meeting re-articulates the story.

Contradiction: Creating adequate structures for sustaining movement. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regions sends out Rose Mary Fleming to Termine consult and then begins to raise her total fare.

Internal: House celebrates with Partick cadre two years of living in the Partick community, Glasgow, over an inked bottle of scotch.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of the newly discovered soft underbelly of the enemy as the most discontinuous part of the year arrives. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Report of Ferndale TM begins to tell as contact with two communities grow directly from events of the day. Also contacted by two service organizations wishing to discuss ways to work together.

Internal: Cramer visits on area trek. Take a look at the past and the future. Sends Pat Coffman and Stephen Evans to Termine HDP consult.

Contradiction: Capturing present momentum to decide and activate models to break loose TM. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: After four core meetings, Lower Broughton finally names July 9 as TM date.

"Son of man, stand upon your feet, and I will speak with you."

Internal: Sends Jean Taylor to Termine HDP. First of four Institute evenings opens with three guests and studies Joseph Campbell on mythology.

Contradiction: Winning with two TMs this spring while building the plans and creating momentum to propel the campaigns into action. (Wk. 9)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Completion of ready to print copy of first ICA newsletter and the sending off of another packet of completed preschool curriculum.

Internal: Celebrates the beginning of Termine project by sending out of four persons from House to consult staff team.

Contradiction: Re-infusing the spirit life to match the indicitive situation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Termine is capped off by visit with WCC official, Pauline Webb, and Alan Elliott UNESCO executive declaring GSD documents are the best, most professional in the world.

Internal: Starts transforming the four story, rent free building belonging to the Benedictines of Saint Bathilde sisters into the Paris House with some of the sisters pitching in to help.

Contradiction: Solidifying major maneuvers on three fronts, GSD, CFC, IGM at the same time. (Wk. 8)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Twenty guests, including Victoria Fellowship Youth and US marines come to assist two local Masons and other volunteers in mixing cement. Maize is planted. Submitted first major proposal to UAC (United Africa Co.)

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS)

for \$77,400 USD. Farmers guild sends representative on developement calls to provide working funds for cooperative. Work Corps applications sent out. Initial design created for Areal Programme. Twelve key fisherman meet to plan workday.

Internal: Vespa takes vacation inkind trip to R.T. Briscoe to get wounds bandaged. Sends out Richard Poresky after week of sojourn. Channel 3 evangelical revival meeting in front of House.

Contradiction: Working in advance of major events and still doing events now. (Wk. 10)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Decision emerges to create House/Nexus to do Town Meeting in own community.

Internal: Breaking loose from usual geography to extend selves all the way to the sea at Oostend.

Contradiction: Moving to intensive TM breakloose in United Kingdom.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House and colleagues plan comprehensive summer program highlighted by Thursday Night Speicals.

Internal: Exciting reimaging of the summer as time of colleague engagement, as House brainstorms Week II events and circuit possibilities. Facility search uncovers several fine possibilities.

Contradiction: Locating through framing those who would dare to just do TM. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Francis is sent out to Termine consult. Week 2 circuits to Wijchin and Venray excite all as Buurtdags in these communities look a realistic possibility.

Internal: Celebrates Pentecost with experimental Day III dynamic from midnight to six inthe morning with canonical hours through the night. Enjoys Pentecost Monday as missional discontinuity.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on this quarter when all the action seems to be happening next quarter. (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Gemeindetag (HRM) in Cologne-Dellbruck with 80 people present and congregation members leading all the workshops. Leaves whole congregation in a state of awe at what they did. A Night at the Institute and speaking engagement with the oldest women's organization in Germany result in several women requesting to work with the Institute in Frankfurt. The two TM's scheduled for the Ruhr Valley in June are catalysing many more for the fall.

Internal: Then guests from Sri Lanka working with Air Ceylon fill the House for several days while House members scatter to Berlin to design display for Kirckentag and to Freiburg and the Ruhr Valley for TM set up.

Contradiction: completing the materials, decor and program design for the Krichentag in the remaining week of preparation with the professional quality needed to do justice to the fact that probably 40,000 people will come into contact with display. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Attend Kreuzberg Ost Stadtteiltreffen (GCF) held

under three big tents in newly renovated park. Food all inkinded including Whoppers, fries, cokes coffee, cookies and fruit. Highpoint was closing plenary reports and presentation of both adult and children songs written during the day. Thirty attend Saturday night celebration in newly opened Greek restaurant in community. Holds first children's after school program in park. Blooming summer flowers planted in park. Guild meeting has new people from Saturday's Stadtteiltreffen and slides of Youth are shown. Businessmen's meeting makes assignments for September Street Market.

Internal: House welcomes four colleagues from continent to assist in preparation for Stadtteiltreffen. All thank you notes written and sent two days after. Development mailing completed. Thorough spring house cleaning results in shining windows and reclaimed space. Sends four to Termine.

Contradiction: Finding keys to setting up new orbit of intensification beginning August 1. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: Two men from ITI arrive and the first brick is fired. First of 3 trucks for Bayad arrive in Port Alexandria. Natural breeding of Telapia in first pond. Bulletin board is up in all stakes.

Internal: Tribal resettlement happens. Has Birthday cake and celebration. Plumbing is repaired and we host visiting guardians.

Contradiction: Turning dependence on governmental structures for action to dependence on village leadership. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Holds workday at Muslim Village. Begins tutoring for seventh grade pupils. Exports 450 kilograms of french beans. Plants 500 strawberry plants at the Kawangware Demonstration Urban Farm. Receives an order for Kamartka products amounting to \$2700 from Europe.

Internal: Receives two interns and two children along with them. Sends out two auxiliary to work with Nairobi Religious House on setting up village Meetings in Kenya's Western Province.

Contradiction: Discerning the key to allow major leadership to assume full responsibility for all the programs in the KHDP. (WK. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External:Kariobangi Village Meeting (March 19th) members organize a second V.M. for Ruarka. Global Health Acceleration Team engages with House and Nexus Development team for whirlwind week of calling. G.H.A.T. hosted by guardian family, William and Julia Gitobo for evening; discover Ruth Gilbert's home town of Ithaca is where Julia went to graduate school.

Internal: Early in the week, four on circuits robbed of all their possessions (except the Village Meeting workbooks) so they did three Village Meetings during rest of the week in one set of clothes each. Reluctantly sent out GHAT colleagues to rendezvous with other GHAT unit in India. First collegium on Nairobi summer assembly (August is not summer in Africa) begins practical planning for the August launch pad into next year.

Contradiction: Deciding to be comprehensively creatively in all those rather than waiting for the future to take care of itself. (Wk. 10)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: Purchases two cows for community dairy shed; secures water tanker in kind to insure continuing water supply for HDTs. Village leaders' development pitch secures 5,000 rupees in cash for rebuilding the community well.

Internal: Makes plans for remodeling collegium space. E.G. heritage trip to Ellora Caves, Awangzeb's tomb creates great excitement.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity on how to optimize troop engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Global Women's Forums in Hyderabad, Nadlapur, Bombay and Chikhale in one week. World Bank's first visit to Maliwada.

Internal: Nagpur circuit rider reports an active cadre eager to participate in GWF and NAVA GRAM PRAYAS. Maliwada E.G. arrive for Bombay Urban exposure trip as part of their eight week "Human Development Training School" curriculum.

Contradiction: What is the structure that will channel the energy sparked by the Nava Gram Prayas in the 15% (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH

External: Global Women's Forum held in Nasile, a Vaviharsh village. Village continues Shramadan on Sunday digging pits for village forestation drive with mango trees.

Internal: The whole auxillary travels to Maliwada for the quarterly Council. VHDP has the great honor of deputing P.T. Jamblekar as Project Director to VTI village, Desmond Balm as Project Director to Vandapur village, Vikas Khare to Bombay on the Development Centrum and Anand Warne to Shelgaon village as project back up. Receive Napoleon Mwithiao from Kawangware HDP as auxillary member in Vaviharsh.

Contradiction: Re-assigning old and new troops to effectively move this coming quarter after having the most experienced staff pulled out. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR

External: Holds two successful Global Women's Forums, one at Poona City and the other at Kendur. Sent out ten farmers for the agriculture training program. Visits were made for development and the authorization.

Internal: The House was busy in the preparation for the Global Women's Forum. The auxillary joins the village for celebration. Receives new interna.

Contradiction: Keeping enegaged with the project work in the village when most of the troops are out for development and authorization visits. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON

External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (work day) on repairing old temple, steps, cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara District capital city. Completes village consus and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and in kind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden is prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James, arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Channeling some of raw enthusiasm and energy to procuring materials and other input that will transform work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Indignation of Movement indicated by troops paying their own travel to consults.

Internal: House celebrates Peter Clements' graduation. Sends out House youth and prepares for "Tea for Two" for the next 3 weeks. Dr. and Mrs. Dan Benedict from Denver stop at the Delhi House while on a world tour to hear replication stories and plan a side trip to Maliwada.

Contradiction: How to use 3 weeks with 2 adults in the House as a break-open time. (Wk.7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Five dry land farming experts of 15 acres of soil for demonstration crop-growing. Mr. Chellapa, The chairman of ICA:India visits NDHP and grants 2 bore well diggings. Preschool children receive equipment for study and play, and uniforms are being made ready. Intensive recruitment for Global Women's Forum is on.

Internal: Receives the Global Women's Forum faculty. Mr. Surrender Reddy gave a fantastic address during the breakfast collegium in Nadlapur.

Contradiction: Being clear on Guild/Stake operations. (Wk.5)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Internal: Corporate sessions are enlivened by report on Nadlapur Consult and the charting of the Tao. Has one job possibility in sight. J.P. Singh family, regional colleagues, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Opening the eyes of colleagues to the excitement of the MHDP and the replication and then flipping it for catalyzing interest in initiating a village project in Area Calcutta. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: HDP site selection trek continues in Sarawak near Sibu and Kapit with exciting reports being sent in by Hays.. HDP bulletin mailed telling the story of Sungai Lui.

Internal: Visit by Maryknoll Father from the Phillipines, Jim Pfeffer, as he seeks methodology for working with local communities, and leaves excited, planning to visit Sungai Lui and Kelapa Dua. Sun Tzu study enhanced by military colleagues lending an air of practicality. Nan and Bill Grow arrive from the Phillipines on their way to Jakarta ITI.

Contradiction: Unclear vision of next stage of development. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Economic Commission formed from successful Kuala Lumpur businessmen. 100 attend Stake meetings and Sunday Gotong Royong (work day) makes kindergarten tables and benches. 60 family gardens have been plowed with the use of borrowed 2 wheel tiller.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR)

Internal: Send out 140 invitations to women for upcoming GWF. Send out Titus on ITI trek.

Contradiction: Absence of one year project plan in which to build the plans and implementation. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Village shopkeepers hold vision workshop. Sudanese dance classes begin for older girls. Agricultural classes begin in each stake. 91 people in educational structures daily (preschool, literacy classes and supplementary classes.) 37 youth start soccer club. ITI trek to central and east Java to finalize registrations. Mrs. Nasution and ladies from the National Council of Social Welfare visit. Largest textile industry in Java visits project to see how it may engage in Kelapa Dua HDP.

Internal: Send Shakland to Hsia Liao Consult in Taiwan to serve on consult team. Stansbury leaves for Australia; Lush returns from East Malaysia trek. We paint the pre-school. Baby Ruth Morris celebrates her first year of existence as well as one year in the project.

Contradiction: Dehabilitating effects of subsistence living swamps corporateness and vision of the village. (Wk.6)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Fine GWF with 40 top women of Hong Kong held at the Furama Hotel which donated the service including a luncheon with red and white wines. Bruce Robertson & George Packard join Nam Wai auxiliary team to catalyze programs. Development treks are out to Seoul, Manila and Hong Kong.

Internal: GWF team each give collegiums on State of Movement and Oklahoma 100 breaking loose new images for the future. Feast celebrates the victory the night before the GWF Day.

Contradiction: Getting momentum into the development thrust. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Preschool opens with ten children and grows each day. Health Day is great success as 100 children are seen by doctors. Colgate Palmolive, Johnson & Johnson, Nestle Corporation are among the sponsors of the day. NHDP Training Center is completed with outside of House having Chinese and English lettering saying Nam Wai HDP Center. Gives Chinese document to villagers; they report it to be better than the English one.

Internal: Guests from Philippines met by one of House permeators come to Nam Wai and cook fantastic Filipino dinner.

Contradiction: Changing low visibility of present actualization. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Hsia Liao GCF, first in Taiwan, happens one week after steering committee of village leaders meets and assigns villagers to workshop leader training for four nights. Four phases attend, including 30% women and four polity levels. Over 200 come, with total of 300 at lunch.

Internal: Enables four nights of training while producing the workbook. Week II has all troops at HDP site for GCF enablement.

Contradiction: Adjusting the focus and not trusting what we see. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Receives first results from letter writing developemnt blitz. Whole House focussed on development and guardian nurture. House planning for all island PSU on replication.

Internal: Celebrate Termine HDP with pizza decor party and transforms collegium room. Negotiating art class. Additional English classes surpasses record income.

Contradiction: Focusing on one aspect of mission creaets blind spots in other arenas, needing structures for data exchange. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: GWF host committee meets to set date budget and quotas.

Internal: Regional and House troops return from successful Hai Ou Consult with reports and excitement about the possibilities.

Contradiction: Continuing the futuric visioning as intermediate steps are completed. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Health clinic construction moves steadily towards completion. Materials donated by Cebu Lions. Labor donated by community on five straight nights, plus all day Saturday and Sunday averaging 25 people each night. Saturday workday re-establishes Purak (stake)5 garden with new fence and land cultivation. Cemented area surrounding will in Purak 5. New hybrid corn and animal fertilizer distributed to 18 families after seminar by Bureau of Plant Industry. Campaign named HIGANTING MAIS or Giant Corm. Fr. Schmidt, of San Carlos University makes site visit and decides to strongly enable proposal of \$51,000 to Misereor.

Internal: ITI participants report to Guild meeting on the two week seminar. Lester Knutsen and Juana Meriquita sent to Dumaguete on self-support seminar. Baticas sent out to family for Week II House attends community wedding.

Contradiction: Pushing through new decisions by community as structures come into concretization. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Lost one GCF in June but gained on in July. In workshop with local officials, the budget for July was created. Hitchhiking cuts circuit cost to only 50 centavos. (7 cents.)

Internal: Youth and EG participate in and help staff the Parish Vacation Church School. Welcomes visit of Julie Orteza form Butuan City. Attends international community's Little Theater production of The Good Doctor. Ecclesiola highlighted by final Sun Tzu study. House Church guests outnumbered House members for first time this quarter.

Contradiction: Keeping things running here when all keep on running to cover all the fronts. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Held third corporation LENS for Sumitomo Shoji.

Internal: Held Daily Office with representation from all 4 Houses in Japan, Global Centrum Hong Kong, and a colleague from Philadelphia.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Fifth City Health Outpost receives grant of \$1500 and plaque for Effective Management. Loan secured to build test market models of furniture in industrial center.

Internal: Memorial Day celebrated with picnic, ball games, bicycling and slides from Kwangung II. Over 125 metro community and House attend. Recieve John Cock and Steve Hamje from Academy and out again. John goes to ITI in Cano Negro and Steve to Missouri TM circuits.

Contradiction: Holding fast to the strategy of environmental transformation in the face of bracketed contradictions. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Summer brochure created for summer circuits. Appointments set for 12 mayors and other leaders.

Internal: Anticipation and workshoping on re-decoring House.

Contradiction: Planning campaign with uncertainty of summer. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Seven TMs in Omaha this spring with TMs Assembly that produces 28 miracles for the coming year.

Internal: House celebrates completion of Spring of Town Meetings in Omaha with first barbeque of the year.

Contradiction: Expanding the vision of new colleagues so as to engage their energy in the entire metro. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Receiving additional troops from all over Chicago area.

Internal: Marge Philbrooks accident impact House to design two some on circuits and impress the need of troops for region.

Contradiction: Chosing towns upward on the grade scale or to bracket for future. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Breakthrough in summer battleplanning methods enables seeing the indicative in relation to flexible models plans Minnesota Future Day celebration pulls together state of the state: Will Balough, Town Meeting Man, a live band and 60 colleagues celebrate five months of expenditure and the launch of Minnesota Future Day. Lois Polari from the Governor's office suggests the skit go on the road and appear at a large training session for workers throughout the state. "It's the best tool I've seenshowing the need for local participation and grass roots planning."

Internal: Welcomes Mary Alice Smalls from Brussels Centrum. Has Laurel and Hardy movies celebrate absurdity in midst of summer battleplanning. Sun Tzu grounded in practical action of development. Youth employment opportunities investigated. Concludes study of Sun Tzu with story telling session of Battle I have fought. Sends out Laxdal family to year assignment in metro.

Contradiction: Gettingsupport and footing under summer battleplan. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: House sent representative to the International Women's Year Conference of Missouri for Global Women's Forum research. Circuits for Town Meeting: Missouri in eight metro towns. O'Fallon TM date and facility confirmed for June 25.

Internal: First phase of House relocation packing and

moving happens on Week II.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between recreating vision in July and moving immediately in intensifying GCF campaign in the region. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: 10,000 newsletters sent out this week through 15 state associations in Iowa. Iowa strategy now turns toward fall set-up as 47 towns consider a TM with 24 community leadership presentations already set. In-kind 25,000 sheets of paper for state brochure plus the printing of brochure will be in-kind.

Internal: Company where Margaret Krauss works closes, completing Margarets job and sending Linda Irenberry back to work.

Contradiction: Changing cimmunities images that nothing can get done during the summer. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Sheboygan TM comes off in grand style. Jaycee workshop leader hosts celebration at his apartment and then comes to Milwaukee where celebrate 1000 with polkas, brats, and beer. Grueling state wide maneuver planning calls to discern victory.

Internal: Statewide news release and TV tapes are distributed. Permeators juggle jobs and two local TMs. Smallest House general, Albert, learns to maneuver on two feet.

Contradiction: Deciding which internal structures are the one which keep the troops standing and which can be bracketed. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Decision to do Town Meeting Assembly as a catalytic tool for closing the maneuver and capturing high ground for fall.

Internal: Memorial Day painting of main lounge and picnic at guardian colleagues home, complete with swimming.

Contradiction: Remembering that now is when to get people signed up for TM Assembly. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: House works to name the 5 priorities for June:TM; Summer recruitment; self-support and development; missional preparation for August onwards; and June 12 House event. Marion TM follow-up reveals assumptions to do another TM as soon as possible and to actualize proposals. Indianapolis colleague raises \$1200 in 8 days for Termine consult.

Internal: 15 of us gather for House Church on a discontinuous weekend that finds House at "Indy 500" parade; cookout at regional colleague's home and viewing "Star Wars" with fascination.

Contradiction:Implementing our self-support battleplan over the next 30 days in the midst of Summer '77 recruitment, Town Meeting, and missional preparation for the coming Fall. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Class of 12 new orchestrators graduate with honors. Columbus colleague gives gift and sets up appointment with 3 millionaires and one foundation. 1000th TM held in 12 places in Ohio. Large TM Ohio posters printed in state color (Cardinal Red) and white with black lettering sets off decor at every TM Hall.Gestetner printed 6 of the 15 documents this past weekend; salesmen met to compare quality of documents. UPI and AP wire

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI)

services interview 4 communities for a major article on "Town Meeting Ohio Communities".

Internal: E.G. assigned to TMs to help with S/S/S workshops. Youth and E.G. clean House in preparation for the orchestrator visitation.

Contradiction: Funding the TM Ohio project with everyone returning to work and 22 Town Meetings to consult. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Press Conference by George Romney gives credence to TM Michigan Week... 23 TMs finalized for Spring and 38 possible for Fall, reaching 118 communities via TM.

Internal: Metro Cadre member comes to House for supper, finds there is no food available. Three metro colleagues go grocery shopping and supply House with many goodies.

Contradiction: Maintaining TM momentum over the summer, holding on to those scheduled, training the orchestrators, doing the Michigan Week TMs, all while preparing for the June 4 Assembly. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

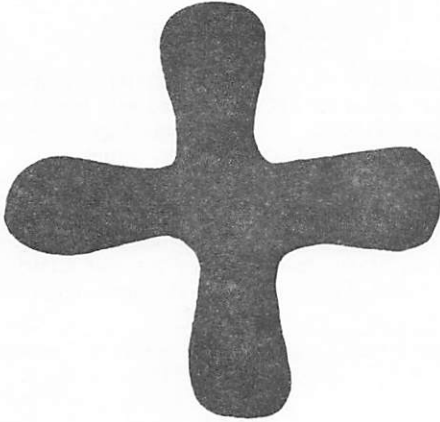

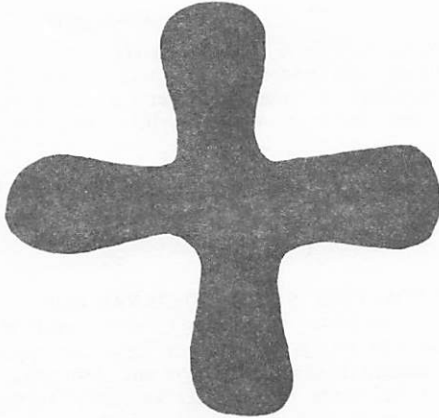

Contradiction: Running with multiple forums while sensing that new maneuver models are required. (Wk. 12)

External: Visits with provincial government officials confirm "New Day New Brunswick" campaign with 45 forums for October. Fire protection fund is up to \$2000 with three to St. John for two weeks and 14 others trained locally; 44 clubs get land for market garden while preschool receives 450 square feet of carpet.

Internal: Visit from Don and Ann Dowling and from New York galaxy members now in St. John, doing a collegium on 5th City and conversation on prayer address all with renewed power of common memory.

Contradiction: Moving it, not just moving around. (Wk. 9)

External: Fourth International Training Institute begins in Cano Negro with 12 nations represented. The village welcomes participants with a drum festival. Guests for the opening dinner include Archbishop Bernal the president of the Municipal Council and Venezuelan poet Pedro Lhaya. Pepsicola donates 200 cases of pop to the program.

Internal: All ITI faculty arrive. John Cock gives a global report to cadre which leaves them all spinning.

Contradiction: Intensifying development to cover project and ITI expenses and provide new capital for project. (Wk. 12)

Global Development Centrum reports the end of the fiscal year around the globe. HongKong reports that Tokyo development task force demonstrated that intensive development can happen without Centrum presence. In Canberra, a prominent artist promises ICA his next painting—his last three sold for \$1000 each. A Perth company urges ICA to submit \$1000 proposal. Cooperation with other major European agencies is key in Brussels, and ties the ICA more closely to large funding groups. The contradiction lies in the arena of keeping the money flowing when one set of strategies reaches completion and another summer maneuver begins.

Global Research Centrum reports ICA Brussels Board members and guardian presence at the Assembly of European Municipalities Conference establishes positive relationship with powerful sister cities network. Bishop in Canberra phones with names of two doctors looking for "something to do" during their sabbatical leave. Phase I summer programs are launched with curriculum based on village life and training in the economic and social arenas. Chicago Centrum focuses its troops on the GRA preparations with full scale recruitment, building transformation, task force planning and decor creation (including the "Victory Plaza", located on the second floor). The contradiction lies in the arena of grasping the one thing the Assembly is about.

Global Operations Centrum reports agri-tourism is initiated before the consult ends in Termine with commitment to continuing support and assistance; translators talk about becoming auxiliary members. In Canberra, Apia's request for GSD slides points to doing authorization that keeps the possibility of new GSD sites moving. Planning has begun in Hong Kong for zonal assignments for the summer months and next year. In Chicago, travel was arranged for GSD participants to go to the Kwangyung World's Fair, saving \$11,000 in the process. ITIs in Jakarta and Cano Negro were completed, and Consult in Oyubari and Vogar begun. The TM Assembly in New Jersey was held, celebrating the largest successful state campaign to date.
