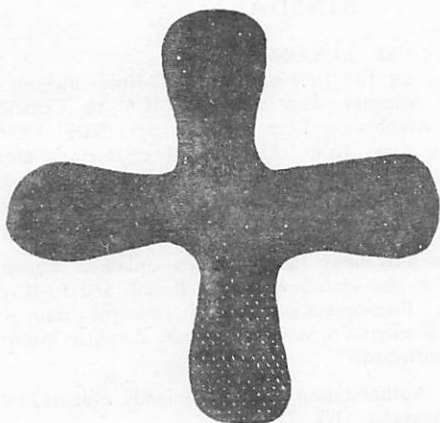


GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

WEEK 9

March 1—March 6, 1977



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Marketing trip for pug shoes nets three orders and other good prospects. Texaco promises to assist marketing. Youth Action Corps holds disco and replaces four windows in their facility.

Internal: Legal trek (Clancey Mann) enables clear picture of relationships and suggests some changes in bank accounts and legal structures. Patty Sands welcomed back from hospital.

Contradiction: Finding ways to utilize our gifts and power to move ahead in structural ways with appropriate shifts in time and space. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Edinburgh Cadre redefines rule as an experiment in new shape of the church to come. Forays with colleagues to Livingston, Gorgie, Maryhill and Port Glasgow reveal local affirmation of TM.

Internal: Journey becomes starry night as awe is occasioned by the pulling together of "Humaness Is..." and the ecclesiola study on "Attainment".

Contradiction: Keeping the TM snowballs growing fast enough to push through spring thaw. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Rondra Valley Wales continues to encourage all relative to TM; sets core and number of people in high positions nod yes.

Internal: Laura goes to Berlin for week; Al Swollon celebrates birthday. School holiday provides study time for students.

Contradiction: Transiting from interest to doing relative to core meeting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Thirty-seven visits made, most of them in six new communities, are made for TM Foray 200. Holds first core

Internal: Don McClain adds another person and Centrum's expertise to TM force. Hosts three other overnight guests.

Contradiction: Grasping the fact that the 36 communities visited for TM are our chess pieces rather than a confusing jigsaw puzzle. (Wk. 9)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Holds meeting to set date and start set up of Woman in the Future. Sets date for core meetings (GCF) in Epernay in the heart of Champagne country and metro colleague goes on the circuit.

Internal: Evening conversation on singing and "participation" renews things taken for granted.

Contradiction: Finding a free car and a free house while circuiting full time. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Guardians cocktail party clicks just right. Legal trekker meets with our lawyer. TM is set in fishing village near Naples. Second pre-consult meeting in Castelgrande sets up a steering committee of 15 to prepare for the consult.

Internal: Sends Helen Lyman to the Hong Kong Consult via Maliwada to get HDP experience.

Contradiction: Having four pairs of hands is not enough, and they have not learned how to beckon others. (Wk. 9)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Vitality of 140 local consultants leaves no doubt that this was Ijede's consult. One hundred people show up for work on first day following consult. Sons of Ijede in Lagos pledge their full support for the project.

Internal: Sends out Global Consult team to Hong Kong. Welcomes Lin Wisman and Jim Ed Bell to auxiliary staff.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS)

Sends out Ellen Addington to celebrate the death of her father. Finalizes implementation workshop in 20-hour marathon.

Contradiction: Discerning profound role of ICA in a community that already is moving, already corporate. (Wk. 9)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Foray 200's last week totals 12 communities, 34 visits, and 74 people.

Internal: Global Language School helps with translation of key documents.

Contradiction: Juggling 30 plates at once. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Movement ICA consultants begin to flourish in Vlaanderen and Wallon, double groups strength and momentum on Foray 200: another four core meetings in the works.

Internal: Welcomes Columbian ITI grad back to Belgie in ecclesiola and sends out Belgian Scheutist ITI grad back to parish in Haiti.

Contradiction: Recognizing the dawning of victory in the 100 miracles each day. (Wk. 88)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Visits 15 communities, sees 25 people, sets two more core meetings and announces another Buurtdag date as House sends two teams out in final week of Foray 200.

Internal: With everyone who is assigned to the House here except Margaret Wenge, House creates structures that will sustain all for rest of the quarter.

Contradiction: Turning excited yeses into assuming practical responsibilities for the Buurtag. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Second week of Foray 200 comes to a close with 1,000 Gemeindeforum brochures printed inkind by Addressograph-Multigraph, ten communities visited and 49 people contacted about Gemeindeforums, the first core meeting held and a second set up. Two HRMs are set up as a kind of side benefit.

Internal: Holds Community Forum task force and Night at the Institute in the House. Welcomes Tim Dissmeyer after ITI and Foray 200 treks and hosts guest Laurel Boyd and Jean Arnold on their way back from ITI Birmingham.

Contradiction: Gathering armory of materials and stories about TM and TM set up. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: The great week of the community putting its shoulder to the wheel. Two standby and watchers jump into Cafe renovation by knocking out walls, preparing floor and clearing out trash. Cafe core meeting held to consult on renovation plans and materials estimates result in three people committing themselves to helping with renovation. Guild meeting outgrows House and has work groups meeting in local residents apartments. Spanish artist writer drops in and proves invaluable consultant for newspaper layout.

Internal: Welcomes Laurel Boyd as intern. Free tickets to Philharmonic "American's in Berlin" concert provide unexpected celebration. Continued miracles in kitchen keeps instate of delight.

Contradiction: Creating structures so that people see themselves structurally plugged into project instead of emotionally and personally. (Wk. 9)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Four are full time development. Holds meetings with Cabinet Minister who welcomes ICA to Central Province and Archbishop Liho asks for next HDP. Four other requests come from chiefs, ward counselors, etc. Twenty more acres come under the plow. Institute has new Zambian face with national figure. Mr. W.K.Sikalumbi as first chairman.

Internal: Jones Sinyanewe family interns, ordained deacon of AME Church and chauffers visiting Bishop and EI/ICA chairman to see President Kaunda. Eight colleagues train at ecclesiola for development visits. Two more Zambian intern decisions are confirmed.

Contradiction: Authorization project demands overshadow other global programs. (Wk. 7)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: Stake 3 calls its own meeting, first of its kind, to recruit for watermain digging workday. ITT telex arrives announcing their gift of enough wire for full Bayad electrification.

Internal: Twenty-three people gather around the table with six Global Health Acceleration Team and five Egyptian interns. Assigns Judy and John Tresise to Chicago to recuperate.

Contradiction: Dealing with complexities of GSD in midst of economic breakthroughs. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Local government officials voice support of KHDP at area development committee meeting. General Manager of East African Power and Lighting (former mayor of Nairobi) visits KHDP and presents check. Breeder rabbits from University arrive to start "rabbits for research institutions" industry.

Internal: New assignments for KHDP, Centruns and teams start. Ecclesiola study of "The Prolegomena to the Rule of the Order" impacts all troops.

Contradiction: Expansion of activities of KHDP calls for new "shadows" and staff time for their training and care. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Assigns one House person full time to Development Centrum. Meeting with KANU (ruling party) representatives in Shauri Moyo (Nairobi), including one who is a Kawangware farm landowner, has overflow crowd peaking in windows to begin Village Meeting set up. First professionally printed VM material comes off the press: a one page brochure.

Internal: Two key conversations spiritize the week as sojourners come to decision deadline regarding future

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI)

relationship to the Order. One, impromptu, led by sojourner (topic: going to Heaven); the other during dinner celebrating the end of a three month sojourner program, has new potential sojourners asking the pushiest questions.

Contradiction: Allowing images that this is a poor country fog development and programs-pay-for-themselves strategies. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: India's Republic Day celebrated with morning parade of school children in new clothes with bright faces, flag hoisting, and afternoon nail brushing and weight checking at just two of the exciting Health Fair booths. An inter-guilds "Kobadi" match. All State Bank of India staff drop by with greetings after getting 101 new accounts opened earlier in the week and a commitment to open a branch here.

Internal: Internal life for Quarter III is kicked off with barbecue celebration on Saturday night while receiving Ecclesiola manual for the quarter which provides context for study of the yellow ur and a celebrative Chinese feast.

Contradiction: Methods of tapping technical expertise available in India in order to sustain Maliwada economically and build the thrust for economic self-sufficiency. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Holds Gram Sabhas in Chikhate and Nadlapur, near Hyderabad. Excites third phase of replication. Bombay city hosts HDTs for two days of exposure.

Internal: Week of wedding preparation with Thursday congregational dinner of Reg Kontz and Crispin Clements and Saturday wedding service in Robinson Memorial Church.

Contradiction: Sniffing the wind for live-in Brown Man while continuing to import from other centers the Indian personnel needed to carry out the task. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH

External: Begins main road paving as the first visible sign. Holds informal guild meetings. Makes public and private sector, development and authorization visits to Nasik, Ghoti, and Igatpuri.

Internal: Sends out two Social Method School graduates to the Kendur Human Development Project, and a couple to the Quarter III SMS in Maliwada. Has first birthday celebrations for two auxiliary members.

Contradiction: Utilizing available expertise from the public and private sectors to concretize tactics estimates, in order to tap the abundant resources. (Wk. 7)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Development trip to Agra and Tucknow yields good authorization from business community for area Delhi village development.

Internal: Ordering office and decorating corporate releases spirit.

Contradiction: Living with ambiguity. (Wk. 8)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Recruits six people in the area trek for GRA. Eleven citizens from Nadlapur villages visiting Maliwada are

greatly impacted. Nadlapur Gram Sabha fully prepared. For the first time India prepares Gram Sabha in Telugu language.

Internal: House rehearses new Telugu song for Nadlapur Gram Sabha "Thandana". The whole community gets invigorated. Redge Kontze prepares himself as bridegroom as per Indian customs and tradition and is sent out to Bombay to meet his bride, Crispin Clements.

Contradiction: Recruiting of more Gram Sabhas to create a reservoir of human resources towards 1,000 participants for GRA. (Wk. 8)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Team trip to Ranchi and Jamshedpur reveals astonishing readiness by local responsible people actively to support financially GSD projects in their vicinity. The possibilities are almost too much. Completes initial village research phase; sends team out to take a look, get their feet wet, and make a recommendation for Area Calcutta GSD.

Internal: Collegium on Daily Office is a profound happening and reveals cruciality of that which can easily be taken for granted. Charles Moore arrives on Development. Gets great clarity on relation of "All the earth belongs to all the people" to development, strengthens resolve to win at funding the campaigns.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in Area Calcutta to go into period of intense discontinuity with continental focus on other parts of India. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Trek to Sarawak, East Malaysia, includes a long House visit, home of key colleague, Jerry Rabu, president of Iban Conference of Methodist Church. Visit with state government officials who pave way for religious study program and future GSD project raises question of how many can we send to Kuala Lumpur Consult. They settle on six.

Internal: Gail Fray from Melbourne, Australia, visits with teacher friend from Portland, Australia, and after the inevitable "What is ICA?" question recalls excitedly the CMA held in Portland recently.

Contradiction: Needing trained colleagues and interns to handle multi-faceted breakloose of possibility. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Villagers of Sungei Lui formally invite the staff of the ICA to their village to initiate the HDP. Centrum and area join legal trek in Kuala Lumpur and papers on registration and tax-exempt status are submitted.

Internal: Creates first Sungei Lui song. Hosts three ITI teams on area maneuvers in Malaysia.

Contradiction: Holding the pace necessary as to move into the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Visibility is key as the first bulletin board goes up in Stake 5. Paints Health Outpost and pours new cement floor, plus builds new bridge to its entrance. Builds eight public toilets in Stake 5. Sends first batch of krupuk (local potato chips) and sells 800 bags in one hour; villager Taryono decides to spend one week in marketing tempe. Elementary Youth Corps class has 30 youth in regular attendance for two hours daily. First preschool community teacher completes whole week on preschool. Anticipation mounts as villagers struggle with decision to attend GSD

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA)

Consults in Hong Kong and Malaysia. Fourteen sign application forms and begin to secure passports.

Internal: Welcomes Lai'ya back with new wife, Sutiyah, boosting Indonesian staff to 11; sends out his sister who sojourned two weeks. Welcomes Sam Hansen and Bruce Donnelly on one-day whirlwind Legal Trek Visit. Lush returns from Malaysia and Singapore. Landrover arrives just in time as rains ruin entrance road.

Contradiction: Remaining invisible to political and visible to village and visitors. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Wedge returns to Hong Kong and Order consenses on Nam Wai Human Development Project. Authorization visit obtains full private and public sector support. Legal trek reports on zone and collects Nexus data.

Internal: House, Nexus, Wedge, and legal trek celebrate the Nam Wai victory with a fourteen course szechuan dinner, complete with corporate songs and reflection.

Contradiction: Isolating the key maneuvers that will focus the total expenditure that has been released. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Joseph Mathews comes back from Sudtonggan and meets with chairman of Rural Committee and District Officer. Hong Kong House area, Nexus consense on Nam Wai as GSD site and make preparations for upcoming Consult.

Internal: House consensus on shifting ecclesiola to consult task force preparation.

Contradiction: Telling stories about shifting the GSD site to different section of people in order to get support. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Chooses Nan Ping, fishing village on the west coast, as GSD site and consensus of whole movement is unanimous.

Internal: Six guests pack House during Wedge visit. Lao Tzu study impacts House and Chinese colleagues. Emerging Generation are home for long Lunar New Year holiday.

Contradiction: Waiting on registration transforms the mundane into the really mundane. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: ITI Steering Committee decides to invite Presidential Assistant Jacob Clave as guest speaker opening night. Development brings in \$2,000. Two more GCFs scheduled. Sends out Fr. Sta. Ana to new parish.

Internal: House painted, ITI files ordered and back office recreated; all activity leads to relaxed Saturday evening celebration.

Contradiction: Preventing let up of pace. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Creates Hualien invitation for spring PLC.

Internal: The House enters the Lunar New Year Celebration with a traditional feast.

Contradiction: Moving ahead while "waiting" for government registration. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Two more families receive rabbits, starting rabbit

disbursement. Starts plant nursery and 1890 Bar supplies chicken manure. Draws plans for commons, health clinic buildings; begins vaccination of neighboring sitios; sewing class holds fashion show; starts nursery for plants.

Internal: Lady gynecologist committee visits clinic twice a month; stone cutters organize. Sends out Garnet family, short term family in SHDP.

Contradiction: Getting the mechanical details done to launch boat and start the generator. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: GCF set-up meeting in Awono, Mabajao on Camiguin Islands sets date for April 23.

Internal: Sends Geni to Hong Kong for Consult and has two representatives judging beauty contest at Rizal Memorial College.

Contradiction: Deciding development is priority for now. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: GCF is beginning to break loose in four communities. Planning meeting for March 10 in Kawasaki has support of mayor's office, education commission, two cultural groups and the mayor will attend. Planning meeting for Urawa is set and the mayor will attend. Planning meeting for Urawa is set for March 19. Sanya meeting develops local leadership.

Internal: Miyata brochure arrives.

Contradiction: Handling GCF national story and strategy regionally. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: The common mill and village treasury sollicitaion of the community by guild leaders focuses the future as a visit from assemblyman from Jeju supports efforts as the primary school opens after January vacation with a new kitchen serving a hot lunch of noodles. Preschool postpones opening a week for teachers to travel to Seoul for a week's training.

Internal: Ecclesiola breaks loose spirit. Inkinds peanut butter and jelly and crackers.

Contradiction: Undergirding economic self-support. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Inkind continues with receiving of refrigerator for the Health Outpost as well as Health Outpost community salaries for one year. Inkind drugs pour in. PLC is held in Seoul, preparation of the Regional Council mailing is completed and the registration documents for ICA are submitted to the Ministry of Health and Social Affairs. Final HRM of Quarter III is held.

Internal: House celebrates the Lunar New Year as guests and visiting colleagues continue to impact with their presence. House search continues to intensify.

Contradiction: Creating long-range grassroots development model. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Former city councilman of 20 years decides to go on key authorization appointment as verification of local invitation to begin Miyata Human Development Project.

Internal: Kikari Goto joins the House in brooding through next strategical moves on initiating the Miyata Human

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA)
Development Project.

Contradiction: Following intuitions rather than anxieties. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA,
External: Continues calling in Ashiya Kabe. Amagaoaki and Ito has TM. Development calling on Religious Orders.

Internal: Colleagues refine TM brochure in Japanese. PCE cultural studies in English focuses on India.

Contradiction: Getting first yes for steering committee. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Visits cadres of people in a bank and school and are presented with money in both cases for GSD.

Internal: American high school sojourner Marty Taylor impacts House and colleagues as she journeys through area on her way to Miyata.

Contradiction: Gathering momentum for GCF with ourselves and colleagues not clear which directions the motivity needs to go. (Wk. 8)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: First circuit following CTC reaps four troika meetings and one CMA date set. Have in-kind breakthrough with free freight for Oombulgurri from four companies. Goes on breakopen calls for CMA in Orange with Apex, Rotary and City. Sr. Monica Sinclair decides to go Nam Wai HDP Consult. Have two speaking engagements; one gives major funding referral.

Internal: House impacted by collegiums: The Moral Issue of Our Time and The Shape of the Church to Come. Tao studies bring new depth to ecclesiola dynamic.

Contradiction: Finding the way to pull together the multiple spinning that will strategically break open Sydney. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Three major city department stores offer in-kind support for Oombulgurri, while speaking engagement with City of Perth Rotary Club on OHDP is followed by conversation on radio talk-back program.

Internal: Studies paper on Capitalization related to GSD gives new meaning to developemnt thrust.

Contradiction: Losing momentum over extended summer break puts behind base one for CMA. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: In-kind push uncovers industrial mincer for pet food production on Oombulgurri and an engineer with a small plane willing to do runs out to Oombulgurri.

Internal: Hosts Bob and Judy White briefly enroute to Oombulgurri.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum to avoid the abyss of despair. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Completes external steel frame of first house, now ready for the roof. School opens with new carpet and paint job and running water in preschool.

Internal: New plants give lift to present decor. Sends Anita Duncan out to Perth. Transport PSU brings objectivity and creativity to Oombulgurri supply line.

Contradiction: Finding fresh tactics and images that really get said Oombulgurri is "My Town". (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: In one 24 hour period Salisbury initiates seven week CMA countdown and affirms March 26 date, Gawler forms final steering committee and affirms April 2 CMA date, Marion forms steering committee and affirms April 30 CMA date, and Blackwood strategizes for Saturday's public meeting on CMA. Regional development is \$1500 in hand for the quarter.

Internal: Ted Clover visits from Sydney Region. House welcomes Yallop for donor circuit and Robert Roberts for Oombulgurri trek. Karen Clover received as intern and Richard Charles received as sojourner at House Church.

Contradiction: Releasing circuits while caring for seven steering committees. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Local coordinators in Colac and Launceston (across the sea) call us to get agenda for meetings they have set up and recruited. Massey-Ferguson Tractor plant offers apprentice training to Oombulgurri mechanics on a yearly basis.

Internal: Creates two transrational systems for getting thank yous and invitations sent out on a regular basis. New collegium decor rationale shifts space and mood to Lent.

Contradiction: Keeping instrument panels in working order as everything well and truly on launching pad and countdowns begun. (Wk. 9)

GLOBAL CENTRUM CANBERRA

External: Sr. Monica, Sisters of Mercy, goes to Hong Kong for consult and may stay until next September.

Internal: Study of American Indian Trek paper sheds light on Australian Aboriginal.

Contradiction: Keeping priorities straight in midst of multiplicity of demands. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: In-kind breakthroughs in preparation for OHDP "Move-It" package includes mechanical drawings for housing, chicks, kitchenware, hardware, peanut seed and transport. CTC recruitment and practices stirs deep affirmation and interest.

Internal: Four job offers in one week actualizes choice of maximum mobility and maximum income. A week of arrivals: Darla Duncan from Oombulgurri, Barry Vogt (Adelaide Region) from Guardians Consult and Andrew David Dayle, son of David and Arlene Freeland, born on November 13, 1976.

Contradiction: Creating the winning tactics that move excitement to commitment. (Wk. 9)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: Economic Acceleration Team of Vance, Devore and Galbraith arrive. Mary Warren Moffet and the "Women of the Future" consult kick off the first of four with 30 present and the social process triangles are translated into Marshallese in preparation. The first rain since Christmas eases water shortage.

Internal: This was the week of "circuit overload" as things spin like a kaleidoscope with intensification on all fronts while half the House is sick.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO)

Contradiction: Creating structural outlet for the rising self-consciousness of local man to allow him to participate in deciding the direction of the future. (Wk. 7)

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA)

External: Three House members go on a 120 mile trek around the island of Savaii as part of a management consultant team for Nelsons Ltd. Cadre task force sets count down timeline for parish community miracle.

Internal: Wedge study gives House fresh feel for movemental edge and reaffirms struggle with question of Samoa being a demonstration nation.

Contradiction: Executing tactical maneuvers with previously named programs that move through the programs and beyond. (Wk. 8)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Week II state meeting unburdens troops and creates a concrete plan for each sector of the state as resolve to win the California 200.

Internal: Spirits are lifted with Bob Vance's return, a new in-kind stove and a great celebration with all four California Houses featuring belly dancing.

Contradiction: Discussing the San Francisco urban plan and getting clear on the contradiction. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Follow up at Los Gatos reveals the "RSI" quality of awakenment in TM. Visalia and Cupertino steering committees meet. Internal: Spends afternoon with potential intern family getting their house ready for sale so they can move by March 1. Knox paper, "Event and Story" recalls the necessity for clarity about our "roots".

Contradiction: Developing the "event-creating story" that insures our pace as "winners". (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Yuba City sets up sponsor meeting toward TM on same day as Marysville across river. Assistant City Manager volunteers for Greater Sacramento Steering Committee. Ilko Steering Committee starts in Nevada.

Internal: Jan Gilster does masterful job at ecclesiola. Twenty-six people gather for House Churchand OSR for week.

Contradiction: Moving from immediate decision to do TM to enduring resolve. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Two TM dates set for April 23rd. Maneuver report prepared for printing.

Internal: Sends Frank Dyson to Nam Wai Consult. Hong Kong team assignments and orchestrator role for 7:30 ecclesiola create gracious and special evening. EG puppet show 'Three Little Pigs in a Religious House' yields even the walls laughing.

Contradiction: Creating practical model to do multitude of next steps with troop and resource limitations (Standing in the Bultmann squeeze) (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Bank of America calls wanting TM and has group all ready to come together. Sends three to Delta Pace consult.

Internal: Four California Houses meet in San Jose to push acceleration phase and come up with exciting holding images for next three quarters. Lenten-solitary office gets done as well as Woman's Forum manual.

Contradiction: Strategizing the comprehensive while standing in the pain and keep element of detachment. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Celebrates development victory of \$1200 with a total of \$4224. Newsletter is ready for mailing.

Internal: Mood of high celebration touched at picnic on South Mountain, where recently arrived House member experiences first encounter with the desert.

Contradiction: Drawing together diffuse but substantial state with clout into a force tempered to deliver TMs. (Wk.9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Maneuver set up takes place as mail out 350 state reports to 50 communities, sets up seven groups for maneuvers Week I and grasp that a maneuver is not only appropriate but necessary.

Internal: Whole House celebrates victory before the maneuver starts by going to "Rocky" and having a dinner conversation on it. Larry Philbrook comes home at last and Joy Thomas arrives for area development.

Eighth edition of community newsletter shows wild enthusiasm with seven pages full to the brim.

Internal: Witnesses new energy thrust with re-organization of task forces into Economic Development, Community Care and Engagment, and Community Design. Harry and Lillian Fast Horse bring personal insights to ecclesiola. Senses excitement in relating to Cannon Ball as community in Bonhoeffer's Community.

Contradiction: Shifting from mobilizing selves to mobilizing all the needed resources. (Wk. 9)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Experiences revitalization of CFC in Morinville and Devon and breakopen visits in Vilna. Wedge team visits GSD site possibilities. Forum colleague from Drayton Valley takes day off work to spark interest in Redwater for CFC.

Internal: Saturday celebration at 'Bonanza' celebrates beginning of Delta Pace and Nam Wai. Preparation for Lenten event and strategizing historic church engagement rehearses common memory of building movemental base.

Contradiction: Wanting to hold back while moving into the radical turn towards GSD and forum set up while undergirding area self-support. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

Contradiction: Doing all three campaigns in a swirl of indirect spiritizing events that are intriguing. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Gets helpful responses from visit to Eagle River. PTA presentations in Nunaka Valley expands possibilities of Anchorage metro strategy for TMs across the metro.

Internal: Attends Fur Rendezvous and witnesses the military might and Alaskan character in parade, the grueling competition of sled dog races. Afterwards, works on rewriting TM workbook.

Contradiction: Finding charge to keep all communities spinning toward TM. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: GSD site selection team crosses area twice in intensified search. Dean of University of Regina Department of Social Work says programs are doing what they are beginning to propose.

Internal: House impacted by post ecclesiola stew with GSD trek team which pushes awareness of the power of our methods on society and site selection brooding.

Internal: San Antonio is visited by Rev. Moon of Hina Texas, and receives first pay check of new era.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Three TMs develop rapidly. Two development projects meeting fruition and responses to newsletter point to building momentum.

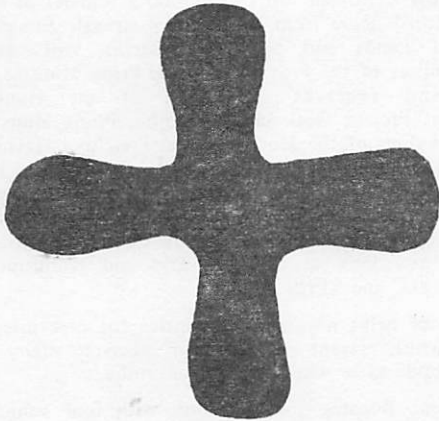

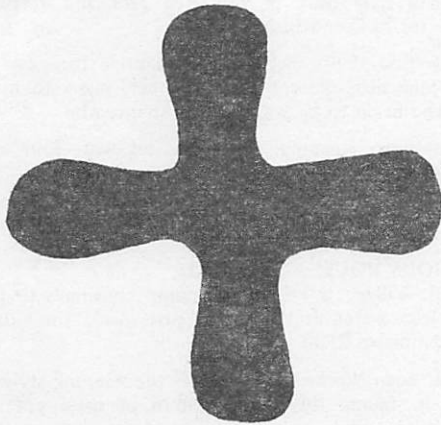

Internal: Contribution from paper company to TM: Wisconsin 100 spiritizes House. The movie Gospel According to St. Mathew impacts all at Ecclesiola. Virginia Kirsch and Bill Newkirk join for reflection on Wisconsin 100 after Appleton TM.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum while economic dragon stands in TM Wisconsin 100 pass. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Many people on the TM: Wisconsin 100 circuits. Governor signs proclamation.

Internal: John and Joyce Francis report on Ijede consult after House Church.

Contradiction: Getting appointments for registration meetings. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

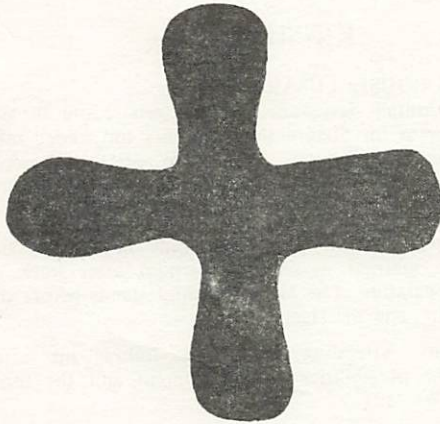

Contradiction: Creating viable self-support system and enabling the mission of this House to be carried by regional colleagues. (Wk. 13)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Five in Heidelberg in one day break loose support for Town Meeting in historic old-city of Heidelberg. Strategy is developing for urban areas revolving around collapsed inner city section and out lying high-rise community.

Internal: Five from house journey to Brussels for Global Priors Council. Receives sojourner Mr. Kumar from Bombay and sends out Patricia and Mary Sands after two week visit.

Contradiction: Translating the necessary materials before the first steering committee meeting this week. (Wk12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Guild reflects upon the events and accomplishments in each of the 13 programs; first elders meeting held in the Communications Centrum; open windows during German class nets 15 people standing outside and listening - five of whom come in to register! Radio showman comes for an interview and does a ten minute spot on the show over KHDP; Six are sent to guardians meeting in Brussels; in-kind miracles every day

net wash basins, dishes, posters, and 100 DM worth of children's art supplies.

Internal: Diakonisches Werk is caring for House culture life by supplying it with tickets for Philharmonie. House participates in frustrations of inner city as finally, after three weeks, it has water (but not hot), in kitchen apartment.

Contradiction: Keeping people motivated when a project is blocked or there are no clear future steps. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Windfall development week gets 2,800 in and in-kinds tractor for Shantumbu. Zambia's top seeded rally driver pledges all future winnings to SHDP. Regional Council plans six PLCs in six metros for replication preparation; 20 grads sign up for circuits and pedagogy.

Internal: Intern sent for month of study in Hungary and other intern married in solemn splendor after week of intensive preparation. The Machisi family stands before the shield, the fire, and the stars.

Contradiction: Attending to detail follow up after exploding the possibilities in development and the three campaigns. (Wk. 12)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: Preschool attendance jumps to 70; 300 people gather for showing of first movie in Bayad's history. Representatives from the World Council of Churches visit, accompanied by Coptic Bishop Samuel, and are excited by project.

Internal: Receives Shaw family, David, Margaret and Gerald, from Area London. House celebration is a camel-back trip into the desert, providing occasion for reflection. Sends out Busses and Boivins to Global Priors Council in Brussels.

Contradiction: Forming images of next major thrust that gives all a way to comprehensively envision the future. (wk. 13)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Columbian ambassador visits KHDP and is interested in project in Columbia funded by UNEP official who he brought along and said that they could do it. Sends overseas shipment of handicrafts. Cement and murrum (gravel) block industries are both in production.

Internal: RS-I during Week II for Order training and The TAO in ecclesiola impact all.

Contradiction: Sustaining present programmes so they don't become routine without losing ground on what sustains. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Circuit team splits - one on foot setting date for VM at first contact while other half sets two more dates, making a total of six VMs for 12 days. Sojourner pulls off spirited mini-VM at committee meeting, all in Swahili. First Nairobi VM is held in Kariobangi, one of the worst Nairobi neighborhoods, with two councillors, two choirs and the local school players. Opens authorization in the city with

Boss's US\$13,000 automobile is entrusted to Geri's care while he goes on extended business trip.

Contradiction: Moving from fascination to doing tactics. (wk. 13)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: India's Republic Day celebrated with morning parade of school children in new clothes with bright faces, flag hoisting, and afternoon nail brushing and weight checking at just two of the exciting Health Fair booths. An inter-guilds "Kobadi" match. All State Bank of India staff drop by with greetings after getting 101 new accounts opened earlier in the week and a commitment to open a branch here.

Internal: Internal life for Quarter II is kicked off with barbeque celebration on Saturday night while receiving ecclesiola manual for the quarter which provides context for study of the yellow Ur and a celebrative Chinese feast.

Contradiction: Getting methods of tapping technical expertise available in India in order to sustain Maliwada economically and build the thrust for economic self-sufficiency. (Wk. 12)

Contradiction: Acting on the one contradiction in the midst of multi-faceted activities needing attention. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Fourteen House members are deployed to OK 100 and to area development; 34 community members participating in preschool work day paint six rooms, hang new curtains, do tuck pointing and repair roof.

Internal: Entire House focuses on env IRON MEN tal campaign in collegiums. preparing all to mobilize the masses. Uncovers in House-to-House visiting all kinds of people ready to provide leadership in spring campaign. Sends Bronwyn Rees back to Oombulgurri preschool after a quarter's participation in 5th City preschool staff.

Contradiction: Creating supply lines for leaders in campaign while formulating others who have not yet made it into the campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Great steering committee meeting in Salina is covered by local radio station as eight towns a day circuit system become effective.

Internal: Orchestrator training gets eight people ready for Oklahoma 100.

Contradiction: Thinking of TM Kansas as a goal rather than a campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Six coordinators host the press to promote three pilot TMs April 2 of April Neighborhood TMs in Omaha.

Internal: Collegium room has new global grid added as gift of Susan McCabe's father and kitchen sports bright resurgent yellow coat of paint, all done on Sunday - first day of House gathering in two weeks.

Contradiction: Changing fantastic city-wide support into concrete community involvement. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: TM mailings gotten out to 10,000 people in Missouri and Kansas through the Association network. Great contacts in Farmland Industry Coop for coop models and staffing of GSD.

Internal: Discontinuity celebrated by the art forming of RSI poetry each morning during collegium. Host to GSD team Mary Ann Mann and Fred Hess.

Contradiction: Maintaining the tension between assignment of gunmanship of a sector, and team assignment to five sectors. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Expands engagement statewide in Minnesota Future Day: Second State Advancement Committee Meeting. In-kinds brochure and all needed printing. Community registrations set up resulting in second TM in East Grand Forks. Whittier PCX of 20 delegates on City Planning and District Committee Action Council and Whittier storefront receives face lifting.

Internal: Legal trek report awakens House to global legal complexities and gets said that there are no national boundaries for GCF. Tao is peak of the week.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on statewide Minnesota Future Day decision and momentum to engage necessary forces. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Interests ten communities in TMs in metro. Area attends Community Registration Meeting at Chase-Park Hotel in St. Louis. Missouri Senate passes a Resolution encouraging Spring of TM's in Missouri. Mayor of Jennings (St. Louis suburb) calls ICA office requesting info on TM. Tower Groves Banks sends commitment letter for \$300.

Internal: Fourteen dozen donuts in-kind for TM project. Many guests visit during week from Area Chicago forces.

Contradiction: Getting key people in each network to get their affiliates to Community Registration Meeting rather than getting the key people only to the Registration Meetings. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Quad Cities luncheon seats 32 around the table to map out TMs for possible 20 communities.

Internal: Five students from Student House travel to Des Moines to help in setting up new Des Moines House. Division South strike force works out of Peoria this week in-kind paper, printing, 60 hour materials and letter blitz. Sends out James Higgins to the army.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between urgency and momentum. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Dickinson County TM closes registrations one week before the big day due to unexpected avalanche of pre-registrations the overtax facility. Visits 15 towns with 10 showing a promising interest.

Internal: Sends Anita Gibson to OK as orchestrator. Sight reads second act of Shaw's "Man and Superman" for discontinuous ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Getting timeline for TMs to coincide with local consensus. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Eleven Milwaukee community leaders visit 5th City. Media mailing for TM:Wisconsin goes out to every radio and TV station and newspaper in state. TM spots go on air for March 26. South Madison TM.

Internal: Ecclesiola celebration with adults seeing Rocky is followed by pop, beer, pizza and conversation. House gathers for collegium in sick room so all can study Bonhoffer's "Community" paper.

Contradiction: Getting world to operate out of same sense of urgency on TM. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Holds sponsors' organization meeting in Marion, Indiana, core meeting in Newburgh, Kentucky, CIF planning in Louisville. Speaking engagement in Evansville, Indiana, awakens dormant polis. Academy recruitment gets amazing results and 15 colleagues spend Week II at House in Imaginal Education workshop with emphasis on tactics for PCE in Louisville's Parkhill area.

Internal: Beginning to turn the tide on self-support as earned income exceeds budget for the first months this year. Crucial maney tactic is actualized as every House member completes filing of all federal and state income tax returns.

Contradiction: Insuring broad participation in Guardians Meeting Week 13. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Secures the new consultant force for TM:Ohio Day well underway with yes from TM grads.

Internal: Large in-kind food donation arrives just in time to cover absent House check.

Contradiction: Pushing TM:Michigan strategies to actualize corporate planning and service coordination. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Four teams (representing four states) out calling in 47 counties- result in 44 communities moving toward TMs during Michigan Week. The Big 3 of the auto industry begin courtesy car rotation to enable TM setup with Pontiac Bonneville Broughm and Lincoln Continental.

Internal: On the road, Holiday Inn, Ramada Inn, Hospitality House, Big Boy, McDonalds et al participate in TMF:MW by caring for circuiters.

Contradiction: Keeping 20 plates spinning while getting 20 more up. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: TM:Ohio moves into second major phase with Consultant Training for over 100 new consultants in seven districts.

Internal: Birth of Justin David Bushman to Donald and Mary Laura Bushman happens on February 25.

Contradiction: Gearing selves up for passing the baton to new consultants that will be doing the 88 TMs. (Wk. 12)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Lower East Side Community Exchange kicked off

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK)

with GSD stor: d a consultation with 25 community leaders on social methods. Fifteen then signed up to go to Ivy City the following week.

Internal: Shared collegium on New Jersey Circuit and Loisaida (Lower East Side) deals seriously with timeline in New York City.

Contradiction: Finding a way to use metro structures to implement full tactical system. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Using direct tactics in steering committee journeying results in new decisions in Bradck and Moorefield West Virginia.

Internal: Engagement by sojourners John Maslove and Robert Hedges results in Academy registration and new job.

Contradiction: Creating tactical implementation after model is built, especially when structural routine sets in. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Binghamton Metro Cadre doubles in size with steering committee members, enabling two GSD nights to be planned. They all plan to return weekly.

Internal: Reports and brooding from area priors meeting enables everyone to get a handle on next quarter, initiating individual brooding and deciding the victory.

Contradiction: Changing backyard context into Area context in order to release troops and time for urbanstrategies. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: Ivy City Council thrust out of Ivy City and into the world through Neil Vances's report on the 24 social demonstrations and Ivy City's own Lawrence Glascoe's report on the Cano Negro Consult.

Internal: House global consciousness bumped via collegium on Wedge report and week presence of Neil Vance, Kathy Bauknight, and Mark Welsh.

Contradiction: Firming back up system: economics, structures, and training. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Area Council redirects focus as we participate in Ivy City preparation and send two to Oklahoma 100.

Internal: Roy and Josephine Kauer wedding happens. Entertains family from Seattle and New Jersey. Hanna Dexter as guest at ecclesiola spins stories of Kwangyung II.

Contradiction: Enabling individuals to turn their excitement into yes from a larger group. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Holds two TMs in two weeks, and each has already had follow up meetings, gestalting proposals into two to four "doable" proposals immediately implementable.

Internal: Area battleplanning and House modification impact all with new responsibility for whole Area vs. own turf. Prior returns from India.

Contradiction: Shaking loose ancient ties to own turf. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Regional meeting finalizes areal battleplanning, determining 58 TMs, 1/10 of towns in New Jersey. Prudential will print 10,000 colored packet covers for TM:New Jersey.

Internal: Dick Alton reports on Chicale, replication in India.

Contradiction: Designing New Jersey launch, state-wide campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: House impacted by participation in hree campaigns: assigns troops to Ivy City, Oklahoma 100 and Movement formation.

Internal: Tactical system step of battleplanning by New York Region on behalf of area deeply grounds "AREA" into consciousness and reappropriates use of indicative battleplanning.

Contradiction: Implanting areal vision and calling forth immediate participation of bi-metro colleagues in Movement work beyond bi-metro. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Sends circuits into central Massachusetts. Sends people to OK 100 and Ivy City community center dedication, enabling story of one mission to be grounded.

Internal: Begins planning for next two quarters with common images and strategies and tactics from the area meeting.

Contradiction: Structuring in needed and effective planning sessions in midst of circuits, committees and RS-I. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY

External: Superintendent of schools in Schenectady announces support of Schenectady 10 TMs.

Internal: Area focus is on massive urban impact in Buffalo, New Jersey and Pittsburgh, impacting House and metro with cruciality of Schenectady 10. Margaret Refior goes to OK:100.

Contradiction: Providing quality consultation and coordination for 10 TMs. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: GSD night brings together old and new colleagues and reaps money in hand and consultant commitment for Lorne.

Internal: Immediate implementation of area battleplan begins by sending one to OK:100 and two to opening of Ivy City Community Center.

Contradiction: Accomplishing everything in the evenings Week I as whole of Week II is spent out of turf. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Experiences its function as Area House with grassroots mailing across Canada, coordination for Lorne and sending Robins to Vancouver for CFC and then Edmonton for area meeting.

Internal: Has tribal resettlement after send-out of Lorne troops, and visit of Slotta family to investigate immigration, permeation and schooling.

Contradiction: Moving the consultant yeses into engagement and cash in hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Swirl of CFC and Lorne consultant visits and phone calls result in first four paid consultants for Lorne.

Internal: With half the adults in Lorne, the remaining troops work on Lorne consultants, guardians meeting and the rest of the mission.

Contradiction: Keeping the story, vision and the future beyond Lorne before and within us in the swirl with few troops. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Hawkesburg trek is enabled by new driver's license.

Internal: Part-time job is won at Catholic Health Association of Canada where ICA led national consultation in November.

Contradiction: Embodying effective priorship style with drastic reduction in resources. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Lorne citizens provide 75 pounds of potatoes per day for each day of consult; 10 Lorne community people form task force in preparation for consult and produce and distribute first Lorne "Voice" to every home, while four teams on the road. The Maritimes net \$4,000 worth of in-kind; 12 are seriously considering consultants, ready for Lorne de l'Acadie Consult. Sets four more CFC dates and opens doors up for development across New Brunswick.

Internal: Bob Porter and Forest Craver conduct area Legal Trek as 26 area troops, including all House priors, gather in Lorne for HDP set-up.

Contradiction: Maintaining chaste attention to specific priorities in midst of a deluge of demands to get advance auxiliary team set-up on site in Lorne and the preconsult miracle initiated. (Wk. 12)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: FIVECA, Venezuelan holding company, collects money from all its affiliates with personal contributions from management, and presents Cano Negro with \$12,500 for transportation needs. Receives 500,000 meters of thread and 150 meters of sheeting materials in-kind to start sewing industry. Fifteen latrine holes are ready for installation of in-kind cement tanks. Community garden is ready for plowing and planting.

Internal: Villagers hold all-night vigil to patron Saint Joseph the Worker in thanksgiving for recovery of child. House gets notice that owner of hacienda wants to move in and auxiliary has nine days to relocate.

Contradiction: Getting clear picture of structure of local legal body for HDP. (Wk. 12)

In New York, Chicago, and Cincinnati the funding of the Global Woman's Forum is begun by its trek members. Nairobi moves heavier into major funding as Colgate-Palmolive promises US\$5,000. The Health Trek members finish their European pharmaceutical blitz. The contradiction lies in operating with minimum structures while the new orbit of development materializes.

The global task and composition was much in evidence as the ecclesiola manual was made ready for printing in Chicago, patron and guardian files were initiated in Canberra and Hong Kong heard a report from a member of Research Centrum:Chicago. Breakthroughs were related to major movemental contradictions as Nexus were engaged in Oklahoma 100, Foray 400 in Hong Kong and recruitment of 10 consultants from Sydney for Sungei Lui. The contradiction lies in the need for common models and structures in the midst of radical engagement.
