

(GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY)
visit HDTS.

Internal: Poultry production begins with one dozen eggs per week.

Contradiction: Breaking away from positions of responsibility in order to turn reins over to villagers. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Tasgaon Consult finishes with garment industry, preschool, playground, demonstration farm and road signs already launched. Recruitment begins for Global Women's Forum in India. Pat Moore goes to Cochin for religious Order consultation. Receives authorization breaththrough in National Janatha Government. Uti, Mondhale, Nandhapur and Shalgaon send quota to HDTS.

Internal: Fifty plus attend Village Replication Project director's meeting in the Bombay Urban Ashram. Nadlapur HDP document is given for inkind printing. All systems are directed to consult document production for Nadlapur, Chikhale, and Ambadi. Adam Thompson and Maxine Butcher pass through on way to Tasgaon Consult.

Contradiction: Coming to terms with role of back-up system for 15 GSDs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH

External: Began first steps to increase village land under cultivation for this coming monsoon by negotiating with the State Bank for providing comprehensive credit facilities to Vaviharsh farmers.

Internal: A two day planning session for the next 13 weeks saves us from the demon of immediacy and gives us a clear picture of our priorities and maneuvers for this quarter.

Contradiction: How to turn on the power of the village leadership to enable effective actuation of tactics and allow the auxillary to play the auxillary role. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR

External: All of the village soil survey is being conducted for one week free of cost by state government. If done commercially, it would cost 10,000 rupees. Inkind blitz provides another week of food for preschool.

Internal: Auxillary rebuilds bathroom in fine style. House celebrates the beginning of the Tasgaon Consult with a fish curry dinner and by sending four staff to Consult.

Contradiction: Expanding the context of the village to enable total participation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON

External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (workday) on repairing old temple steps, cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara (district capital city.) Completes village census and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and in-kind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Chanelling some of raw enthusiasm and energy to procuring materials and other input that will transfrom work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Mohan initiates cadre pledging in Delhi for cadre

participation in circuit rides and HDPs and rest of cadre follows suit.

Internal: Four E.G. and one Youth, all of whom were in serious academic difficulty, finish rigorous annual exams and are sent out on celebrative trek to Chandigarh.

Contradiction: Deciding the maneuver that will win the war in midst of urgent cries for troops from six points on the battle front. (Wk. 5)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Receives two members for auxiliary from Ambadi. House is busy preparing decor for the Consult.

Internal: Chairman Joe Mathews meets chairman R. K. AtoI of Vazir Sultan Tobacco factory and finalizes funding and sponsorship for NHDP.

Contradiction: Shifting the Area House within three weeks to auxiliary House NHDP (Nadlapur Human Development Project). (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Consultant recruitment calls and follow-up reveal possible interest in a village project in Area Calcutta.

Internal: A Week II of House Refurbishing and old colleagues drop by; sent Adam Thomson to Tasgaon Consult and Liz Marques returns from Nadlapur Consult.

Contradiction: How to structure time for getting the task done and telling a story that enables follow through. (Wk. 4)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Visit to Roman Catholic hierarchy reveals deep collegiality and desire to work closely. Sees first film of Sungei Lui Consult. Anticipation reigns as battleplanning and timeline is built for the current and oncoming quarters with development, ITI, WIF and Sarawak site location projected. Key colleague comes for celebrative meal and enjoys films of Sungei Lui Consult.

Internal: Enjoys full staff again, first time in six weeks, as Hays family returns from Sungai Lui Consult. Employs whole House and Centrum dynamic with Garnett Banks in one-hour clean-up miracle.

Contradiction: Focusing patrons and colleagues into effective donor circuit. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Mung beans harvested and seed distributed to village farmers. Marshall Jones family spends week filming village happenings. Solution to rice problems found. Fifty at Guild meeting to hear the report of five villagers who just returned from Sungai Lui consult, a great happening for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Ipung, third daughter of Shnardi family arrives. Ibu Mien's mother, sisters, and brother visit. Staff members return from Sungai Lui consult.

Contradiction: Changing the momentum created by villagers returning from Sungai Lui into visible action. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Forty-two women attend Kartini Day luncheon, where prestigious Indonesian woman gives talk. Development has best week of year with \$7,300. Unilever food expert visits village. Mung beans are harvested. Inkind 10 desks, three typewriters, carpet, and one jeep that runs

and has license plates. Grasshopper spray service reaches other village farmers and hopefully saves rice crop.

Internal: Yuwono from Tangerang and John Repi from Manado, Sulawesi sojourn for one month. Finishes planning week end. La'iya returns from Sungei Lui to pick up his wife from Kelapa Dua to be the first Indonesian family on global assignment back to Sungei Lui.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the local and area task, both of which seem so be bigger than thought. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Development treks on road in Tokyo, Taipei and Hong Kong. GCF trek in Davao also continues. Global Health Acceleration Team (GHAT) arrives and goes to Nam Wai for Advisory Week. EI/ICA reports for January and February 1977 completed.

Internal: GHAT collegium reports on GSD projects visited and shapes screen for analyzing progress of projects. HDP decor grounds the world grid with photos from various projects.

Contradiction: Focusing in on positive images relative to development story to put in the punch and urgency. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Preschool opens with 10 children and grows each day. Health Day is great success as 100 children are seen by doctors. Colgate Palmolive, Johnson & Johnson, Nestles Corporation are among the sponsors of the day. NHDP Training Center is completed with outside of House having Chinese and English lettering saying Nam Wai HDP Centre. Gives Chinese document to villagers; they report it to be better than the English one.

Internal: Guests from Philippines met by one of House permeators come to Nam Wai and cook fantastic Filipino dinner.

Contradiction: Changing low visibility of present actualization. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Inkind breaks loose with 32 guardians at luncheon. Village Meeting results in invitation and immediate move to village. All-day visitation results in open house attended by majority of the village. Decides to hold GCF Week 4.

Internal: Move to Hsia Liao HDP site leaves two task forces in Kaohsiung to coordinate inkind, development and consultant recruitment. Two task forces move to village to do village signs and arrange consult practices. Whole House gathers for first House Church in Hsia Liao.

Contradiction: Discerning the forms of spirit life that sustain and undergird the mission with House in two locations, one entirely Buddhist. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: ITI opening feast is highlighted by speeches by Bishop Rosales of Antipolo and Monseignor Ortiz. Area celebrates the participation of eight from Sudtonggan.

Internal: House participates in the opening feast of the ITI in the midst of finalizing details for its launching.

Contradiction: Maintaining style and care while depleted of staff, furnishings and decor during ITI. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Seminar for 25 managers (one day LENS) is well received.

Internal: Sun Tzu study in Chinese is one hour of awe relative to being indirect.

Contradiction: Keeping head above water in daily nitty-gritty in midst of mementos missional activities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Sends eight Sudtonggan leaders to ITI:Manila. Manager's Meeting of leadership of the industries meets together to begin the Economic Commission dynamic. Enrollment begins for new quarter of Adult Education, including Basic Visayan to be taught by a Sudtonggan resident, Paul Osborne, of U.N. Development Program, who comes via Rome to assist on fish pond development. Market Day is held to offer local Sudtonggan structure for buying and selling goods.

Internal: Douglas Sanson, Cebu attorney, comes to sojourn in Sudtonggan. Sends Elsa Batista to her first ITI. Celebrates Thomas Prather's sixth birthday

Contradiction: Breaking loose cash development and house self-support. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: The GCF ball is rolling now in northern Mindanao with the second GCF in two weeks; no details have been reported back yet, but more than 200 were anticipated at the Agoho GCF in Camiguin Island.

Internal: Sends out Jack and Nancy Callum to the faculty of the Manila ITI and Christine Perez out to participate in the same ITI. Repeated attempts to break into the House during the night results in a 24 hour security system set up with much corporateness between the House and neighbors also suffering from burglaries.

Contradiction: Keeping the continuous things continuous while time schedule is so discontinuous with troops shifting in and out constantly. (Wk. 4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Sends Hickey, Karikoski, Emura as Area task force to Yubari and secures invitations from local leadership and mayor and free facilities for the consult and auxiliary. Thirty women registered for Global Women's Forum.

Internal: Sends out Joyce Quimby and Jim Oberg after celebrative miracle of common operational file system across zone.

Contradiction: Converting many who are interested into the committed. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Health trek completes stay with fair, commissioning of health workers and initiation of bath house construction. Community elects new English-speaking leadership; dump truck arrives.

Internal: Comings and goings of troops reflects project's role as key training center.

Contradiction: Carrying out priorities in midst of changing leadership. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Acceleration team of St. Clair, Early, and Hamje join with village chief Kim Bong Joon and Holcombe in

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL)

concretizing plans for economic acceleration between now and the GSD World's Fair. Rafos visits as development files are updated and the development budget for the Fair is finalized. Receives \$500 from International Lutheran Church as part of its Easter Offering and inkind xeroxing of 39-page document in Korean prepared for government on the World's Fair. Principal Lee Chul Kyung is key in coming Global Womens Forum, with introduction to National Housewives Association director, who helps in locating facility and promises financial support. Holds consult with 100 key student leaders at Kum Ran High School.

Internal: House Church is a happening as three House members celebrate birthdays the same week. Ecclesiola is great with representatives of the economic acceleration team, Hong Kong Nexus, JHDP, and three guardians.

Contradiction: Operating out of consensus in midst of acceleration. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Foray 400, a two-week GCF maneuver in areas Tokyo and Hong Kong, gets to flying start as House visits 19 communities in five metros during first week. Sponsors committee meets and begins implementing plans for upcoming Global Womens Forum.

Internal: House studies first session of Bonhoeffer's "Community".

Contradiction: Turning mild interest into steering committee strength for GCF. (Sk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Declaration statement for incorporation printed. Eight communities visited on circuits with yeses starting to emerge.

Internal: Collegium puts development records on tag system following Quimby's visit.

Contradiction: Mobilizing slowly around critical financial situation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Priors of Area Tokyo and Rafos from Hong Kong Centrum discover new possibilities at end of road as Oyubari, Hokkaido, becomes second GSD site in Area Tokyo.

Internal: End of the month is celebrated by bankers and others at ecclesiola, and bankers become excited about raising money for GSD. Makes task force assignments to the Philippines and Taiwan, permeation assignment to the USA, and GSD site research to Hokkaido, leaving university sojourner of three weeks as sole person representing region in House.

Contradiction: Intensifying efforts for GSD Consult while troops are scattered to four winds. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Jim Thomson and Ted Yallop decide to hold two guardian functions to recruit for Guardians Meeting and to expand new networks. Newcastle circuit enabled by Sister Betty McGee, secures people for GSD promotion night, CMA blitz plus \$200 in hand.

Internal: Evening time design re-arranged to allow viewing of Roots. Jay Zahrt sent on nine hour train journey to school camp. Bill Norton joins House for two weeks and provides only male dynamic.

Contradiction: Renewing external momentum through CMA and development. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Contacts are made with grads and friends at country Eucharist service and other churches with emphasis on CMA. Goes on circuit to Denmark and other southern towns. Three packages of goods are sent to Oombulgurri.

Internal: Potato digging on public holiday nets two bags for House, while garage is cleared to be restored as work area. Part time jobs net \$100. Youth continue to be involved in jobs, sports, clubs.

Contradiction: Concentrating on getting second jobs amidst making CMA appointments, thus reducing possibility of making and keeping them. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Has speaking engagement with Darwin Rotary Club on GSD and Oombulgurri. Top End Air Express does its first inkind flight to Oombulgurri.

Internal: Sends out colleague from region, Lucy Cooper, to U.K. for holiday with Isle of Dogs address and order for pug shoes.

Contradiction: Recreating the vision that focuses brokenness into a solid plan of action. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: First Oombulgurri air express flight lands at Oombulgurri airstrip from Darwin. Second guild night of week hosts David White as strategizing for cattle muster begins. Dresses 150 lbs. of fresh meat (pork and poultry) for local consumption. Piggery pays first wages from real earned income. Sends out teachers to Darwin to visit schools and do shopping. Sam Alberts travels to Darwin in search of new four-wheel drive vehicle for services program.

Internal: Hosts Jones family for filming, David White and Rob Yallop. Welcomes Melinda McFarlane as new school teacher; begins construction of new room in House.

Contradiction: Being ready to appropriate readiness for engagement when and where it happens, in spite of urgency and complexity of physical and social demands presently facing the whole community. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Momentum builds for Michell Park CMA, the third in Adelaide metropolitan area in April, with funding and energy support from two Rotary clubs, one Apex club, Leos, Jaycees, and confirmation of Lions 16 schools donating 26 reams of paper, A.B. Dick donating ink and 125 masters, four churches donating all the food, Adler Machines donating the company's best typewriter for the day and the city council donating four large boxes of historical decor. Preregistrations continue to come in. The Adelaide donors circuit releases six guardians for consult participation.

Internal: Robert Yallop and Barry Oakley arrive for donors circuit and orchestration of CMA. Reproduces 1000 slides; mounts and mails them to Area houses. Monday Anzac Day work blitz transforms House.

Contradiction: Launching new maneuvers in the three campaigns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Three Jaycee Districts write in to request ICA participation in their special regional seminar on Rural Youth in the Future plus their Annual Conference. Geelong Grammar School schedules Oombulgurri Speaking

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE)

Engagement for May. Georgetown CMA Steering Committee begins 8 week count-down even though consultant tied up in airplane cancellations.

Internal: Bill and Maxine Norton return from Sungai Lui H.D.P. Consult full of stories of village life in Malaysia. Our two high school students star in "Goliath" jazz show.

Contradiction: Making actual contact with people already waiting for CMA, GSD consults, etc. (Wk. 4)

GLOBAL CENTRUM CANBERRA

External: Receives invitation from Sisters of Mercy to rewrite their charter. Puts together new GSD slide show.

Internal: Two return from Sungei Lui Consult and report that even more exciting than consult itself is actuation that took place during writing of the document.

Contradiction: Telling story of guardians meeting to allow people to decide to come. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Inala Journal continues to give front page feature status to CMA; development brings in dollars and in-kind typewriter.

Internal: Second car accident in a month means two down, none to go--leading to in-kind car push; Easter discontinuity provides opportunity for inter-Region presence.

Contradiction: Finding the way of expanding people's context to the comprehensive, for deciding necessity. (Wk. 4)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: Hefer project rabbits finally arrive with island-wide interest and requests for stock. Don Hinkleman and Rich Michael actually leave islands after send-out two weeks ago. when tickets come through. TASC completes its second year's financial statements and receives solid approval at board meeting regarding present trends. Preschool expands by three more children.

Internal: Transforms corporate space with aid of coconut wood and inkind burlap and brown stain. E.G. go to camp-out allowing parents some much needed solitude during family time. The king's son has birthday party and invites House E.G. to participate.

Contradiction: Catalyzing Marshallese decisions. (Wk. 5)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: In the midst of land dispute, a sign of determination is raised by dismantling the playground in one day and celebrating its relocation.

Internal: Easter Week II launched with pre-brooding on missional engagement highlighted by a wide variety of church activities and grounded in the practical with a badly needed house clean-up day, all done in the midst of a Tualoa (windstorm).

Contradiction: Turning defeat into victory with cadre embodying global catalytic style. (Wk. 4)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: TM San Francisco moves to neighborhood level as 5,000 posters are prepared for distribution and twelve

different community flyers in several languages are mocked up and printed (50,000 of them), all in one weekend.

Internal: First St. John's church celebrates 130th anniversary with a presentation on the Nam Wai Consult by Linda Chang, congregation member, and on Cano Negro by Wendell Clutz. House caters celebration dinner and earns money for cookie jar.

Contradiction: Building the corporate decision to do all 13 TMs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Maneuver team sets up twelve TMs in the San Joaquin valley. Senior citizens' TM in San Jose looks possible. Alum Rock says yes to TM.

Internal: Week end discontinuity brings renewal to tired spirits.

Contradiction: Seeing that troops are advancing in spite of some setbacks. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Visits twenty plus communities with ten core meetings set up in Valley area. Bob Vance reports \$2500 worth of inkind for the next five weeks in motels and restaurants.

Internal: Has a spirited Friday night strategy and debriefing session with a large number of metro colleagues.

Contradiction: Insuring that troops dont lie down and die in midst of operating on "death ground". (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: "Alderbrook Attack", Saturday blitz to launch mini campaign with metro and House troops yields four teams on the road with eight group meetings set up in communities. Excitement mounts in use of Oklahoma style model toward effective set-up methodology.

Internal: In-depth study of JWM "Three Campaigns" re-enlivens vision for House and regional colleagues as kick-off for the Olympic peninsula mini-campaign, culminating in crab feast.

Contradiction: Keeping campaign momentum going with no speed limit on TM. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Holds workshop training in two communities. Orient: Mission Church gives \$150 for work in Kwangyung HDP.

Internal: Plans the quarter through the first set of maneuvers in California valley small towns. Illness takes toll in energy.

Contradiction: Figuring out the implications of the Oklahoma strategy on more complex Suburban communities of geography. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Hits the road. Gilbert TM, Maricopa County Hospital holds planning session using TM methods.

Internal: Nobody is home - everyone is out on appointments. Office system enables TM progress.ecclesiola study Friday A.m. and Saturday evening in-House meeting with Vance.

Contradiction: Living out of a comprehensively chaste TM set-up model. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Experimentation with four-week quick set-up

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY

External: First saturation TM in U.S.A. was held in Schenectady county and every neighborhood held a TM on the same day: Princetown/Duanesburg, Rotterdam, Scotia/Glenville, Belledue, Mount Pleasant, Hamilton Hill, State Street/Woodlawn, Union Street/Stockade/Downtown, North Schenectady, Niskeyuna. All have great TMs.

Internal: Reality of areal maneuvers comes alive with overflowing of Hanke House at celebration and Linblad living room at House Church.

Contradiction: Following up these TMs with concrete implementations. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Boston/Rochester bi-region participates in last minute count down as entire House travels to Schenectady for final promotion blitz one week prior to "Schenectady Meets-10 Town Meetings!"

Internal: House size doubles as we welcome Joyce Carlton as staff and Rhonda Wiltse for the summer and host colleagues from Montreal and Newark bringing news from Lorne Consult and New Jersey Campaign.

Contradiction: Releasing ourselves to build implementaries for remainder of quarter which will allow us to care for Boston tri-metro. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: One person holds fort in Montreal while rest of House enables and participates in Lorne Consult. Development treks are carried out in Montreal as consult goes on in Lorne.

Internal: Internal life shifts as entire House participates in Lorne Consult for varying lengths of time. Wayside Inn hosts entire area on way to Lorne.

Contradiction: Creating the model that involves donors and consultants to Lorne HDP. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: New colleague, Sylvia Stannard, asks to go circuiting and announces decision to participate in Lorne HDP for one year. Five people at Bobcaygeon Forum follow-up say they are willing to go calling and on CFC circuits, one person goes to second half of Academy and old colleague from Saskatoon reappears.

Internal: Receives 1/2 of troops back from Lorne, Don Elliott and his business partner from Denver, as maneuver planning begins for next six weeks. Inkind victories lift spirits.

Contradiction: Consensing as to which next steps are keys to larger practical vision of many Ontario Forums. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Regional net emerges when Hearst Steering Committee member opens consultation possibility with the association of franco-ontarian teachers, (AEFO).

Internal: Begin new quarter with new team and commission assignments and a new up-to-date prayer wheel which includes Vogar, Manitoba.

Contradiction: Trusting that the internal and logistical support will enable us to win in the external. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Lorne citizens provide 75 pounds of potatoes per day for each day of consult; 10 Lorne community people form task force in preparation for consult and produce and distribute first Lorne "Voice" to every home, while four teams on the road. The Maritimes net \$4,000 worth of in-kind; 12 are seriously considering consultants, ready for Lorne de l'Acadie Consult. Sets four more CFC dates and opens doors up for developme^{nt} across New Brunswick.

Internal: Bob Porter and Forest Craver conduct area Legal Trek as 26 area troops, including all House priors, gather in Lorne for HDP set-up.

Contradiction: Maintaining chaste attention to specific priorities in midst of a deluge of demands to get advance auxiliary team set-up on site in Lorne and the preconsult miracle initiated. (Wk. 12)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Pours pedestals for columns of Community Center. Latrine houses are finished. Pours floor for auxiliary housing. Meneven Oil Company donates \$650 to project and Benedictines give two rabbits for rabbit industry. Mails donor report. Receives three ITI registrations. Begins production of sheet industry. Army returns and begins drilling second well.

Internal: Ecclesiola on Sun Tzu impacts House.

Contradiction: Intensifying ITI recruitment. (Wk. 5)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum closes April with a \$250,000+ month and experiences itself in high gear moving into May with a \$260,000 target, anticipating major breakthroughs in corporations, foundations and government agencies. The winning categories of bastions, Sammurais, Gerkas and Immortals seem right to hold the images of the new orbit of global development. Europe is experiencing breakthroughs in a new way, having the largest April in their history. The contradiction lies in the arena of focusing on the key contradiction, raising the needed money, which is the key contradiction of the whole Order at this moment in history.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research reports media breakloose with viewing of first rushes of Jones' Kawangware and Caruso filming of Oklahoma 100. The arrival of Crockers for Summer '77 preparation signals launch of the annual event. This year: July 3-16 with Council July 20-30 is the proposed schedule, with 500-1,000 people sought for the Research Assembly, with strong representation from HDP projects. Practical work on particular issues, especially on project replication and acceleration with an underlying theme on the Interior of Winning, with some 42 task forces have already been recommended. The Global Panchayat Task Force on Order Polity was launched April 1 and began working May 1 with Lyn Mathews, Isobel Bishop, Marilyn Crocker, David Morton and John Epps, the last three serving as proxies for Kamala Parekh, Kang Byoung Hoon and Joseph Slicker. The contradiction lies in the arena of doing the effective programming for on-the-spot motivation for training of future troop strength.

GLOBAL OPERATION CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum received news that Canberra rprepares new 115-slide show for GSD and reproduced a set for each Australian House. They included pictures of Kelapa Dua, showing consult dynamics and grounding them in the 18 programs of Oombulgurri. CMAs in Australia move toward paying for themselves. Chicago is recruiting for the last four consults as the team returns from Lorne and prepares to leave for Termine in Italy. GCF gears up for weekends of more than 50 TMs as Area Chicago's statewide campaigns accelerate. The contradiction lies in the arena of enabling the troops to expand the missional priorities.

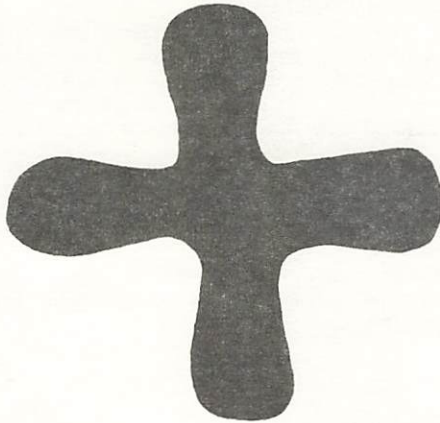
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum experiences breakthroughs in the arrival Thursday and unloading and sotring, one at a time, of 12 tons/35,000 inkinded TM workbooks. A one-night blitz for preparation and packing of materials for 100 TMs ais done in two hours. Conversation relative to the work of the Panchayat in relation to Order Ecumenical principles focuses in depth on issue of "the power is in the center of the table". Experiences breakthroughs in Order finance with a focused chart of accounts which enables helpful reporting and eliminates large globs of miscellaneous unrelated data. The contradiction lies in the arena of systematizing the details and functions to enable anyone to understand a specific task and not get bogged down in Management immediacies.

External: Circuits to six towns, with cores emerging in four. TM Lochee nets 100 reams of inkind paper.

Internal: Joel Wright spins exciting story of TM set-up across the area.

Contradiction: Creating motivating stories for communities and forces that will catalyze the set-up of 10 TMs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Formulates new role as TM coordinator for Great Britain.

Internal: House is gracious presence to guests from Paris, Watchet, Isle of Dogs and Manchester. Wrights return from two week continental assignment to Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Orchestrating maneuvers that actualize Quarter IV tactical steps for TM. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Sets two sponsorship meetings in Ormskirk and Lower Broughton; Litherland decides to proceed with steering committee meeting.

Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce.

Internal: Swirl includes renewed celebrational aura for ecclesiola, lightning visit of J. Wright with exciting news of Ferndale TM and three mailings (GSD trek, development pledges) and invitations to set of three institute evenings.

Contradiction: Locating the right point of tension between a pressing need to have any sort of TM and the need to have TMs in exemplary style. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Initiate new phase of programmes by holding the first Global Womens Forum with 23 participating.

Internal: The ICA is now a legally registered association under the law of 1901 in m France.

Contradiction: Dicing not to be victimised by something not around. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Goes on 14 development calls and four visits to Termine as local confidence grows.

Internal: Collegiums highlight long-range vision for Italy, cooperatives and socio-economic instrument.

Contradiction: Practicing diplomacy and patience in the face of bureaucratic and political fog. (Wk. 6)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Ijede Reconstruction Day sees 75 residents participating in cleaning spring, building bus stop, painting and cooking lunch. Road grader supplied by largest construction company in Nigeria. Secures maize, tomatoes, tete, soko, and okra seeds for planting. Two days of development yields \$2,000 US\$ in hand.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS)

Internal: Vespa II motorscooter notches up another crash and keeps on going. Upstairs windows finally are installed in House as Lagos' 90 inches of rain a year continues to fall.

Contradiction: Charting and following the appropriate course in the midst of conflicting community images of alnd ownership, land use, HDP function, and style of engagement. (Wk. 6)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Holds TM training session for Area Brussels with Nexus in attendance.

Internal: Celebrates the completion of March with full employment - one job for UPI, two with NATO.

Contradiction: Building the financial action plan that allows three campaign support when concentrating effort on major funding for GSD campaign. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Gathers six yeses for Termine HDP Consult in one week.

Internal: Sends Paul Schrijnen to the Ruhr Valley on first continent-wide GCF maneuver,

Contradiction: Doing framing that is all initial visits in one day. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Den-Haag and Amsterdam Global Women's Forum courses turn up new people who are ready to move now. Development doubles monthly pledges and secures new consultants.

Internal: Hosts Global Women's Forum teaching team at ecclesiola. Experiences first week of fulltime child care. Celebrates Koninginnedag (Queen's birthday) with translating the coordinator's manual into Dutch with colleagues.

Contradiction: Prioritizing when everything is both possible and necessary. (Wk. 6)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Steering committee meetings for TM in Essen and HRM in Cologne are scheduled for same nite Grids 350 Religious Order locations and clusters them in preparation for intensive development push.

Internal: Week II task forces recreate basement rooms into spacious E.G. area and pull together German songs and quotes for TM workbooks. Grand fondue celebration with metro colleagues culminates day.

Contradiction: Deciding the creative flexibility necessary to maneuver events into being, while holding the transrational model. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Seventeen present at first session of third English course, overflowing the classroom. Third edition of community newspaper, Kreuzberg Ost Laterne, makes profit. First two meetings of steering committee for Gemeinde Forum (TM) held. Two major Berlin Hotels donate furniture for Cafe. Plans drawn up for refurbishing

park space in Kreuzberg Ost in April.

Internal: Space and model creation to receive 22 youth coming for work week.

Contradiction: Setting up the situation so that local people win after having decided to participate. (Wk. 3)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Celebrates windfall development week of \$2,800; gets tractor for Shantumbu. Zambia's top seeded rally driver pledges all future winnings to SHDP. Regional Council plans six PLCs in six metros for replication preparation; 20 grads sign up for circuits and pedagogy.

Internal: Sends intern for month study in Hungary. Other intern is married in solemn splendor after week of intensive preparation. The Machishi family stands before the shield, the fire and the stars.

Contradiction: Attending to detail follow up after exploding the possibilities in development and the campaigns. (Wk. 2)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: Topic of first community collegium discloses initiating brick industry; two hours later, news arrives that Oxfam, London, gives nod to funding to initiate brick industry within two weeks. Parade of 70 preschool children throughout the village in new uniforms causes much excitement. General Petroleum Company, largest in Egypt, supports project with commitment to drill two wells and gift of 20 light poles.

Internal: House is surprised and delighted by early arrival of Mark and Jean Poole and Aaron Nelson. Decor blitz transforms space in time for new arrivals.

Contradiction: Gaining new levels of governmental authorization relative to project acceleration. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Holds TM focused on health held in Muslim village with over 200 participants. Secures plot for construction of a model murram house.

Internal: Sends the four Nexus Youth to Kenya coast for four days of missional discontinuity. Begins using collegiums for work on Order studies.

Contradiction: Taking the new structures which are being created continually and turning them into operational structures which can be maintained with minimum troops. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: House, Nexus and Health Acceleration team join forces for Village Meeting in Kawangware Project; then two Kawangware interns join House circuit team for two Village Meetings "up-country" along with regional colleague, Ali Mohammed Juma. Inkind victories this week include Rex Rotary running off 4,000 VM workbooks in their shop, an advertising agency agreeing to do all aly-out for Swahili VM posters and social process triangles.

Internal: Celebrates victory of VM in Kawangware with House Church of 40+ around table at Nexus. Telephone, installed two

months ago, is finally ½ operational—we can call out, but no one can call in yet!

Contradiction: Relaxing after discovering creative solutions to yesterday's road-blocks. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: Purchases two cows for community dairy shed; secures water tanker in-kind to insure continuing water supply for HDTs. Village leaders' development pitch secures 5,000 rupees in cash for rebuilding the community well.

Internal: Makes plans for remodeling collegium space. E.G. heritage trip to Ellora Caves, Awangzeb's tomb creates great excitement.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity on how to optimize troop engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Tasgaon Consult finishes with garment industry, preschool, playground, demonstration farm and road signs already launched. Recruitment begins for Global Women's Forum in India. Pat Moore goes to Cochin for religious Order consultation. Receives authorization breakthrough in National Janatha Government. Uti, Mondhale, Nandhapur and Shalgaon send quota to HDTs.

Internal: Fifty plus attend Village Replication Project director's meeting in the Bombay Urban Ashram. Nadlapur HDP document is given for in-kind printing. All systems are directed to consult document production for Nadlapur, Chikhale, and Ambadi. Adam Thompson and Maxine Butcher pass through on way to Tasgaon Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences the ambiguity as another layer of the community's economic patterns are revealed in the discussions with the bank about financing the next crops.

Contradiction: Winning the confidence of the community while working on the long-range tactics of electricity and irrigation that will open the door to substantial economic development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR

External: Contacts Canara Bank for loans; visits Dr. Usha Shah about nutrition program. Shaw and Wallace visit farmers. Plants garden. Launches Global Women's Forum set-up in Poona and Kendur. Sends out Madani Tribhuwan for site selection to Koliapur district.

Internal: Completes 13-week timeline for decor. Gets ration card and rations within two minutes. Cleans 100 kg. of wheat; celebrates Maharashtra Day by planting vegetable garden. Receives Claire Clements for vacation visit and is entertained by her dance. Celebrates Reg's birthday.

Contradiction: Building the support structures of activating the community structures that get the job done. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON

External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (workday) on repairing old temple steps, cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara (district capital city.) Completes village census and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and in-kind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Channelling some of raw enthusiasm and energy to procuring materials and other input that will transform work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Reestablishing donor circuit uncovers new and old colleagues. Meets with key women colleagues regarding Global Women's Forum scheduled in Kuala Lumpur in June.

Internal: Centrum visits by Banks and Stansbury happen. Holds first ecclesiola of quarter with building guest list revitalized through colleague visits. Three young RS-I grads visit who are excited about visiting Sungai Lui HDP.

Contradiction: Using time effectively over against multiple tasks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Mung beans harvested and seed distributed to village farmers. Marshall Jones family spends week filming village happenings. Solution to rice problems found. Fifty at Guild meeting to hear the report of five villagers who just returned from Sungai Lui consult, a great happening for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Ipung, third daughter of Shnardi family arrives. Ibu Mien's mother, sisters, and brother visit. Staff members return from Sungai Lui consult.

Contradiction: Changing the momentum created by villagers returning from Sungai Lui into visible action. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Forty-two women attend Kartini Day luncheon, where prestigious Indonesian woman gives talk. Development has best week of year with \$7,300. Unilever food expert visits village. Mung beans are harvested. In-kinds 10 desks, three typewriters, carpet, and one jeep that runs and has license plates. Grasshopper spray service reaches other village farmers and hopefully saves rice crop.

Internal: Yuwono from Tangerang and John Repi from Manado, Sulawesi sojourn for one month. Finishes planning week end. La'ya returns from Sungei Lui to pick up his wife from Kelapa Dua to be the first Indonesian family on global assignment back to Sungei Lui.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the local and area task, both of which seem so bigger than thought. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Development treks on road in Tokyo, Taipei and

(GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG)

Hong Kong. GCF trek in Davao also continues. Global Health Acceleration Team (GHAT) arrives and goes to Nam Wai for Advisory Week. EI/ICA reports for January and February 1977 completed.

Internal: GHAT collegium reports on GSD projects visited and shapes screen for analyzing progress of projects. HDP decor grounds the world grid with photos from various projects.

Contradiction: Focusing in on positive images relative to development story to put in the punch and urgency. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Preschool opens with ten children and grows each day. Health Day is great success as 100 children are seen by doctors. Colgate Palmolive, Johnson & Johnson, Nestles Corporation are among the sponsors of the day. NHDP Training Center is completed with outside House having Chinese and English lettering saying Nam Wai HDP Center. Gives Chinese document to villagers; they report it to be better than the English one.

Internal: Guests from Philippines met by one of House permeators come to Nam Wai and cook fantastic Filipino dinner.

Contradiction: Changing low visibility of present actualization. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Hsia Liao GCF, first in Taiwan, happens one week after steering committee of village leaders meets and assigns villagers to workshop leader trainign for four nights. Four phases attend, including 30% women and four polity levels. Over 200 come, with total of 300 at lunch.

Internal: Enables four nights of training while producing the workbook. Week II has all troops at HDP site for GCF enablement.

Contradiction: Adjusting the focus and not trusting what we see. (k. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: ITI practices, development appointments, guardian meeting prep and Global Women's Forum recruitment keep House on the road. Holds Global Women's Forum Saturday, May 7. Participants include wife of new USAID director and director of the National Federation of the Role of the Philippine Women in the Philippines as well as other great authorization figures. Highlights of the ITI are Ur images course, worday cleaning sewers and community reformulation labs. Kim Han Ok arrives from Korea to be part of the ITI staff. Distributes 160 invitations to Guardians Meeting. Sends two goats to Sudtonggan by boat. Interview with "Business Day" official may lead to a series of articles on Sudtonggan in the most widely read business magazine in the Philippines.

Internal: Marie Paul reports on India at House collegium. Many people visit: Kim Han Ok, Betty Pesek, Doris Hahn, Francis Coker, Marie Paul and Kathy and Marshall Jones.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate mind amidst experimentation with new structure of mobile task forces. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Seminare for 25 managers (one day LENS) is well received.

Internal: Sun Tzu study in Chinese is one hour of awe relative to being indirect.

Contradiction: Keeping head above water in daily nitty-gritty in midst of momentous missional activity. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Gets going 700-meter net and soft deep sea fishing boat. Holds workday of 100 people on generator shed and 11 X 15 meter health clinic foundation with materials that were inkinded by Cebu capital Lions Club. Adult education classes start English and Visayan literacy classes and welding class led by engineer Ybanez welds barrels for water cooling system. GHAT arrives and surveys 10% of the families.

Internal: Welcomes Global Health Acceleration team and movie team arrives. Consult agreement with government moves House toward self-support. Celebrates the week by seeing "Rocky" with ice cream afterwards.

Contradiction: Reimaging not being ready to move beyond Sudtonggan to replication. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: The GCF ball is rolling new in northern Mindanao with the second GCF in two weeks; no details have been reported back yet, but more than 200 were anticipated at the Agoho GCF in Camiguin Island.

Internal: Sends out Jack and Nancy Callum to the faculty of the Manila ITI and Christine Perez out to participate in the same ITI. Repeated attempts to break into the House during the night results in a 24 hour security system set up with much corporateness between the House and neighbors also suffering from burglaries.

Contradiction: Keeping the continuous things continuous while time schudule is so discontinuous with troops shifting in and out constantly. (Wk. 4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Receives invitation letter of authorization from mayor of Yubari for HDP. Furnishes housing free of charge for planning team, which moved to Yubari on Friday; consult facility is assured free of charge. Consult invitations go out to all Houses and five Japanese consultants sign up to attend. More than 70 GCF registrations have been received for Global Women's Forum in Week 6.

Internal: Completes quarter's battleplanning. Is impacted by ecclesiola candlelight. Meals for the quarter are being planned by two men, alternating each week, which leads all to anticipate the unknown daily.

Contradiction: Creating new strategies relative to local campaign to enable assignment of bilinguals to HDP sites. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Village leaders and auxiliary gear in for June fair with building of financial undergirding plan, assigning village participation in construction projects and locating industrial shed site.

Internal: Economic acceleration team arrives; Bob Rafos stops in and auxiliary reorganizes as World Fair Company with platoon and squads to mobilize forces for June Fair.

Contradiction: Symoblizing with a solid sign the new community decision to move with speed. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Holds PLC of 20 pastors at Uijongbu. Global Women's Forum with 60 women is highlight. Arrival of Mary Warren and Ellen accelerates work with women with new contacts in Korean Women's Association and wives of colleagues and guardians. Mailing for World's Fair as well as new arrivals and massive construction symbolize GSD acceleration. World's Fair troops reorganize for last eight-week assault. Oberg is in Seoul for massive development campaign. Key contacts at Bank of America and Community Development Foundation reveal exciting possibility.

Internal: Hosts Kan Shin Chul from Jeju and sends Kim Han Ok out to Manila ITI and Taiwan Consult. Welcomes Rich Michael, Ed Ames, Andy Batchellor en route to Kwangyung, Rafos on development.

Contradiction: Keeping smiling in the face of surprising impossible demands. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Foray 400, a two-week GCF maneuver in areas Tokyo and Hong Kong, gets to flying start as House visits 19 communities in five metros during first week. Sponsors committee meets and begins implementing plans for upcoming Global Womens Forum.

Internal: House studies first session of Bonhoeffer's "Community".

Contradiction: Turning mild interest into steering committee strength for GCF. (Wk 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Yeses to TM: Awayi, Kashiba Minabe and GSD in Oyubari. Registrations coming in for two Global Women's Forum. National English language newspaper on Global Women's Forum sparks more interest.

Internal: Bergdalls visit lays out seriousness and excitement at O-Yubari. Massive job hunt produces results. Some more new jobs start from permeation push.

Contradiction: Engaging colleagues enthusiasm in development as in TM. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Translates newspaper articles of OHDP into English for Houses and had first meeting with local host committee.

Internal: Meets key community leaders and experiences life of Oyubari through visits to a sushi restaurant, a local women's volleyball club coached by the community's number two spirit man, the local free public bath and welcomes Terry Bergdall to the project from Fukuoka.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity of role of catalyst in enabling the existing corporate structure. (Wk. 6)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Jim Thomson and Ted Yallop decide to hold two guardian functions to recruit for Guardians Meeting and to expand new networks. Newcastle circuit enabled by Sister Betty McGee, secures people for GSD promotion night, CMA blitz plus \$200 in hand.

Internal: Evening time design re-arranged to allow viewing of Roots. Jay Zahrt sent on nine hour train journey to school camp. Bill Norton joins House for two weeks and

provides only male dynamic.

Contradiction: Renewing external momentum through CMA and development. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Contacts are made with grads and friends at country Eucharist service and other churches with emphasis on CMA. Goes on circuit to Denmark and other southern towns. Three packages of goods are sent to Oombulgurri.

Internal: Potato digging on public holiday nets two bags for House, while garage is cleared to be restored as work area. Part time jobs net \$100. Youth continue to be involved in jobs, sports, clubs.

Contradiction: Concentrating on getting second jobs amidst making CMA appointments, thus reducing possibility of making and keeping them. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Has speaking engagement with Darwin Rotary Club on GSD and Oombulgurri. Top End Air Express does its first inkind flight to Oombulgurri.

Internal: Sends out colleague from region, Lucy Cooper, to U.K. for holiday with Isle of Dogs address and order for pug shoes.

Contradiction: Recreating the vision that focuses brokenness into a solid plan of action. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: First Oombulgurri air express flight lands at Oombulgurri airstrip from Darwin. Second guild night of week hosts David White as strategizing for cattle muster begins. Dresses 150 lbs. of fresh meat (pork and poultry) for local consumption. Piggery pays first wages from real earned income. Sends out teachers to Darwin to visit schools and do shopping. Sam Alberts travels to Darwin in search of new four-wheel drive vehicle for services program.

Internal: Hosts Jones family for filming, David White and Rob Yallop. Welcomes Melinda McFarlane as new school teacher; begins construction of new room in House.

Contradiction: Being ready to appropriate readiness for engagement when and where it-happens, in spite of urgency and complexity of physical and social demands presently facing the whole community. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

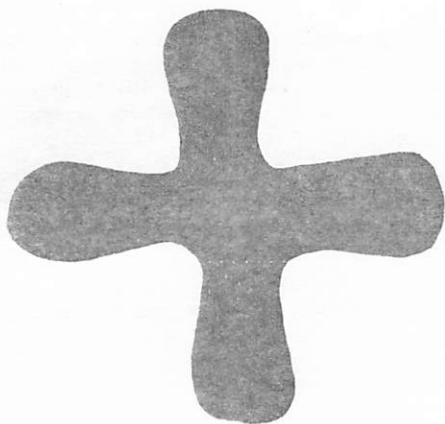

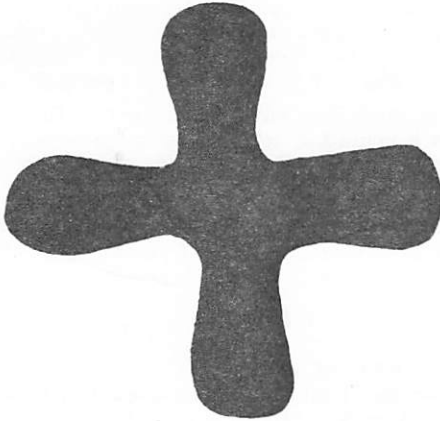

External: Celebrates windfall development week of \$2,800; gets tractor for Shantumbu. Zambia's top seeded rally driver pledges all future winnings to SHDP. Regional Council plans 6 PLCs in 6 metros for replication preparation; 20 grads sign up for circuits and pedagogy.

Internal:Sends intern for one month's study in Hungary. Other intern is married in solemn splendor after week of intensive preparation. The Machishi family stand before the shield, the fire, and the stars.

Contradiction:Attending to detail follow up after exploding the possibilities in development and the campaigns.(Wk.2)

Internal: Coming and going all week as troops staff Shelgaon Gram Sabha. Has in-kind, development project directors meeting and guild work.

Contradiction: Shifting the responsibility of the project from the auxiliary to the village leadership. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON

External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (workday) on repairing old temple, steps, cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara District capital city. Completes village census and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and in-kind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden is prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James, arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Channeling some of raw enthusiasm and energy to procuring materials and other input that will transform work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Indignation of Movement indicated by troops paying their own travel to consults.

Internal: House celebrates Peter Clements' graduation. Sends out House youth and prepares for "Tea for Two" for the next 3 weeks. Dr. and Mrs. Dan Benedict from Denver stop at the Delhi House while on a world tour to hear replication stories and plan a side trip to Maliwada.

Contradiction: How to use 3 weeks with 2 adults in the House as a break-open time. (Wk.7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Five dry land farming experts of 15 acres of soil for demonstration crop-growing. Mr. Chellapa, The chairman of ICA:India visits NDHP and grants 2 bore well diggings. Preschool children receive equipment for study and play, and uniforms are being made ready. Intensive recruitment for Global Women's Forum is on.

Internal: Receives the Global Women's Forum faculty. Mr. Surrender Reddy gave a fantastic address during the breakfast collegium in Nadlapur.

Contradiction: Being clear on Guild/Stake operations. (Wk.5)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Internal: Corporate sessions are enlivened by report on Nadlapur Consult and the charting of the Tao. Has one job possibility in sight. J.P. Singh family, regional colleagues, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Opening the eyes of colleagues to the excitement of the MHDP and the replication and then flipping it for catalyzing interest in initiating a village project in Area Calcutta. (Wk. 6), on: Holding

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: HDP site selection trek continues in Sarawak near Sibuh and Kapit with exciting reports being sent in by Hays.. HDP bulletin mailed telling the story of Sungai Lui.

Internal: Visit by Maryknoll Father from the Phillipines, Jim Pfeffer, as he seeks methodology for working with local communities, and leaves excited, planning to visit Sungai Lui and Kelapa Dua. Agricultural classes begin in each stake. 91 people in educational structures daily (preschool, literacy classes and supplementary classes.) 37 youth start soccer club. ITI trek to central and east Java to finalize registrations. Mrs. Nasution and ladies from the National Council of Social Welfare visit. Largest textile industry in Java visits project to see how it may engage in Kelapa Dua HDP.

Internal: Send Shakland to Hsia Liao Consult in Taiwan to serve on consult team. Stansbury leaves for Australia; Lush returns from East Malaysia trek. We paint the pre-school. Baby Ruth Morris celebrates her first year of existence as well as one year in the project.

Contradiction: Debilitating effects of subsistence living swamps corporateness and vision of the villageage. (Wk.6)

External: Hsia Liao GCF, first in Taiwan, happens one week after steering committee of village leaders meets and assigns villagers to workshop leader trainign for four nights. Four phases attend, including 30% women and four polity levels. Over 200 come, with total of 300 at lunch.

Internal: Enables four nights of training while producing the workbook. Week II has all troops at HDP site for GCF enablement.

Contradiction: Adjusting the focus and not trusting what we see. (k. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: The two trucks were filled with 100 colorful villagers for journey to county seat to participate in Parents Day song and dance festival; 150 bags of sand and gravel removed up mountain cliff out of gorge daily for all the new building in the village. Economic acceleration team is moving fast. New equipment and supplies arriving almost daily and lease signed for Kwangyung Trading Post.

Internal: Tables are always full with people coming and going; special guests this week Mrs. Foss (John's mother) and friend from Minneapolis. Attends housewarming dinner at one of the new homes in the village.

Contradiction: Imaging the Fair as a necessity for the village, island, nation's future and operating out of a fifteen day countdown rather than one day at a time task. (Wk. 8)

External: Meeting with Sydney Area Prior for mid-course corrections in development, CMA, ITI, etc.

Internal: Ligtermot family, movemental colleagues from Perth, visit for a week in trip by caravan across Australia. Impacted by collegium study of papers on Women's Forum and Kwangyung II.

Contradiction: Insuring total SEAPAC participation in the many upcoming events. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

Contradiction: Community struggling with priorities with no comprehensive vision. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Evening with the Institute held in Samoan Tale (house) in Faleulafu, with 10 guests while 10 looked on. Occasioned further interest in a Methodist High School GCF. Pacific wide authorization broadened through East Asian Pacific Institute Training program for the Diocese of Western Samoa, with Pacific Council of Churches Secretary and E.I. staff member representing the Ecumenical and Global thrusts of Church renewal.

Internal: David St. John receives three scholarships totalling over \$3000 for school next year. He is accepted into the University of California: Berkeley Engineering School and comes in second in track meet.

Contradiction: Creating images for the total campaign in July and August. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Four TMs in San Joaquin Valley on May 21 come off as spirit happenings. Dinuba, Biola, Tranquillity, Rich Grove, and Firebaugh are impacted. Set up team firms up more in June.

Internal: Dick Best gets new job in same company. Moves from fork lift to machine operator trainee. House lifts up Ecclesiola dynamic with chicken dinner from the Colonel.

Contradiction: Allowing future possibilities to engender present paralysis of nerve. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Visits twenty plus communities with ten core meetings set up in Valley area. Bob Vance reports \$2500 worth of inkind for the next five weeks in motels and restaurants.

Internal: Has a spirited Friday night strategy and debriefing session with a large number of metro colleagues.

Contradiction: Insuring that troops don't lie down and die in midst of operating on "death ground". (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Saturday orchestrator training a spirit happening for 16 colleagues from Vancouver B.C. to Oregon. Troops experience the fact that it takes their death to make Town Meeting a life happening for the community.

Internal: Vancouver B.C. and regional colleagues join the House for a magical mystery tour with Chinese food, old fashioned singing and black magic.

Contradiction: Making sure that: each contact; sustaining TM dates; pursuing new dates; or developing to undergird the TMs is a spirit happening. (Wk.8)

Contradiction: How to get the region to say the yes to practically giving time and dollars towards Vogar and Summer '77 excitement. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Trek to Kodiak finds good response from community for holding another Town Meeting and opens the door to working with the native villages on Kodiak island.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Ames, Texas, decides to have a TM.. Census Tract 17 in Beaumont is planning its 1st anniversary year's planning session and celebration following their June '76 TM. City of Dayton trains 8 workshop leaders. Mailed 60 development letters and proposals to mid-size corporations.

Internal: Good Ecclesiola - Sun Tzu begins to make sense to Western rational minds. Collegium reflection on plans for Summer '77. Received Development team of Ken Fisher and Marianna Bailey.

Contradiction: Finding ways to enable "summer is coming" mindset both internally and in communities to serve mission to do Town Meetings. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Town Meeting intensifies as the Hereford shifts the date of TM second time to insure victory. The old community leadership in a small town look for the new leadership that would release Stinnett to have a TM. House member is invited to be part of the leadership to form a single adult group at St. Paul's United Methodist Church.

Internal: All the House experiences business and pleasure as the Week II assignments allows time to explore the canyon country and attend a dance. Jose Greigo is first House Church guest this quarter.

Contradiction: Being coiled to strike when all seems well. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Town Meeting shall rise again. Parish Day with Town Meeting method hit the spot at St. Jude's church, held the 21st of June. It was in Spanish and English.

Internal: Participation at Mass Sunday morning at St. Jude's was a sign of a new relationship with our parish.

Contradiction: Keeping the long push to get 5 TMs this quarter and not letting the spirit die. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: All 117 communities which participated in Oklahoma:100 have been revisited. Every town is thrilled over the orchestrators who led their TM, showing that all have learned sophisticated and flexibility in any situation. Strong affirmation is received as communities begin to see their victory in actuating a proposal and in withstanding intimidation from John Birch Society.

Internal: Mr. and Mrs. Rodney Foster from South Carolina visits House during Central City 5 guild meeting. House is spruced up through spring House cleaning.

Contradiction: Pushing communities beyond doing an isolated implementation of a proposal which would be doomed to failure without a comprehensive plan. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Twenty six TMs scheduled for June 4 by East Texas 25 Maneuver Team. This includes \$10,000 committed from towns with additional \$20,000 well on its way. Most towns decide to use local workshop leaders.

Internal: House and maneuver team celebrate with pizza, beer, and Rocky.

Contradiction: Engaging new movement from past TMs and the 26 yet to come in the long march. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PACE

External: Delta Days team brought in flyers from two of the five secured TMs. Title XX proposal for the child care center has received a verbal commitment. Contradiction: Knowing how to put the missional vehicle in holding pattern without running out of fuel. (Wk. 4)

External: Makes assignments for 87 TMs; maintains circuiters in Missouri, New Jersey, Ohio and welcomes back troops from Wisconsin and Michigan.

Internal: Begins work on summer motifs,; paints guild hall in effort to completely re-decor entire building. Forms several task forces dealing exclusively with summer. Hears key collegium by Dowsetts on Oombulgurri.

Contradiction: Embracing the summer while in the midst of manning the campaigns. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO
