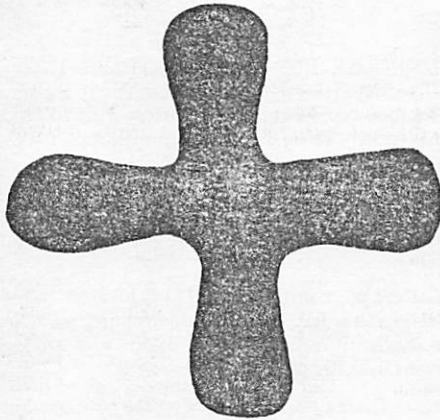

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Power house floor laid, with John Moore and Danny Nichols each working five solid hours. Project acquires good van for 85 pounds sterling and about 300 pounds worth of donated paint which is being used to brighten Cahir Street.

Internal: Resettlement completed and Guild Hall space redesigned to provide Daily Office space, collegium room and lounge.

Contradiction: Quickly establishing signs of winning that local people can point to. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development Centrum enables region to write development maneuvers for the year. Wales maneuver document arrives and holds potential for Quarter II Scottish maneuvers.

Internal: Anne Conroy is sent out to be part of the staff for the Academy. Job search moves into interview phase.

Contradiction: Communicating the cruciality of the moral issue of the time to the 15%. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Town Meeting Wales, with 2,000 miles covered, 40 calls, inkind goods and services approaches 2,000 pound mark all in the first week of the operation.

Internal: Circuiters create a new song to hold the campaign.

Contradiction: Creating the models that will actually accomplish the task within a condensed time design. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Colleagues join in for regional planning and give vital input and commitment to Manchester Maneuvers. Jean Taylor and Carroll Smith join troops in Bristol for the Wales Maneuver. The second of three mini-councils is held in New

Castle with twelve attending, highlighted by reports of youth participation in Kreuzberg Ost and Isle of Dogs.

Internal: Three-hour flying visit by House circuiter from Wales generates sense of excitement and participation in signal area maneuver. Year's supply of inkind soap arrives in time to wash soot-covered House caused by washing machine blaze.

Contradiction: Naming the focus of multiple possibilities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Authorization visit to Bishop of Evreux marks 108% of French bishops now visited. Clancy Mann's presence in Paris occasions very positive visit to UNESCO. Participation in Continental GWF pedagogy session kicks off planning for November 19 GWF in Paris; the GWF site in the Benedictine monastery next door is acquired for course use.

Internal: Moving into the new morning time design and collegium construct brings the discovery that two people can have a great collegium, daily office and breakfast. The arrival of Yvonne Guenec occasion space resettlement, and new guest room just in time.

Contradiction: Preparing House for winter in order to get on with the work. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: Visit with Fiat and EEC starts development ball rolling.

Internal: Whole House travels 26 hours to fantastic continental council in Brussels. Emerging Generation stays with Termine neighbors to participate in annual fiesta of St. Vincenzo.

Contradiction: Spreading the troops like jam and the money like butter on a whole loaf of Italian bread and having it taste like anything. (Wk. 13)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS - IJEDE HDP

External: First coordinators' meeting held to structure and expand care of Ijedians broadens context of those working in specific programs and gives specific tasks to all. Development pushes toward inking essential services of electricity and water. The new Ijede map, done by a surveyor, helps lessen the confusion of Ijede paths.

Internal: All new auxiliary members have been initiated to Lagos go-slow.

Contradiction: Initiating new structures so that things do not fall through the cracks. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Calls in the Netherlands give great hope for major funding proposal.

Internal: The end-of-the-quarter celebration combines seeing "Bridge Too Far" with a midnight standup dinner.

Contradiction: Getting all systems full press before the quarter begins. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Colleagues say yes to circuiter role, disclosing new facets to enabling key visits. Five women attend GWF pedagogy. Stefan Van Istendal announces six-week sojourn in Maliwada.

Internal: After area council, Schrijnen gets plastered (from knee to toe). Phoning for Guardians Meeting elicits seven yeses so far.

Contradiction: Holding maneuvers together long enough to discern the victory and the next steps. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The Sting Development Maneuver occasions a yes in every visit, as colleagues are addressed by GSD and community. A Town Meeting contact and her husband decide to attend the Guardians Meeting.

Internal: Management Centrum's visit grounds the seriousness of the Year of Management and the necessity of common operating principles.

Contradiction: Asking the right questions and telling the right story that will make Town Meeting in the Netherlands the edge. (Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Second edition of TM workbook is typed after excellent re-working by steering committee of June TM. After bracketing one community for the summer, ICA returns to find that they had been meeting by themselves for three weeks in preparation for October first TM.

Internal: Grand continental council reveals an unprecedented corporateness across the continent and reinforces conviction that present advantages and strategies call for pioneering with TM in urban communities. Welcomes Martha Dempster.

Contradiction: Broadening the constituency of active steering committees. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN- KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Advanced English begins with 17 students and recruitment intensifies for German classes. Mayor Pietschker brings seven colleagues to Cafe zur Laterne for cake and coffee. Quarter planning weekend involves 50 with many making decision to focus their engagement in specific tasks -

printing, translating, teaching children, editing the newspaper, being in the cafe and many others. The first year of the HDP is celebrated in Saturday night feast at the Cafe.

Internal: Maria Maguire returns from GWF pedagogy in Brussels with the date set for the Kreuzberg Ost GWF; 800 marks arrives for Development via Maguire travel fund.

Contradiction: Enabling the decisions to assume new roles of responsibility to be implemented. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: The Ecumenical Institute: Lusaka is registered in Zambia. The showcase ITI plays a key role, with 70 attending from seven nations, 22 on the staff from East and West and 11 from Africa. Focusing community analysis, local church course, E Village Meeting and work day all on one village gives amazing power to the ITI. The general secretary of the YWCA, in radio interview, says her entire staff should go to the next ITI.

Internal: Letters pour in from new ITI grads back home who are ready to get to work. Three Zambians purchase tickets to attend the Academy in Chicago. An office with a telephone in downtown Lusaka is set up.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to the new freedom and obligations that come with official government recognition. (Wk. 1)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: The community garden is planted. The Public Work Corps, with no former experience in construction skills, builds a very professional pump house with plumbing too. The first steps for setting up the year's funding is done in Europe and the United Kingdom after Continental Council, and it looks possible.

Internal: Said Riskalla keeps the brick factory and garden going while the Nelsons are on discontinuity. Pooles, Boivins, and Amal Marcos return from Continental Council. Michael, from the American University of Cairo, sojourns for three weeks on his way to a job in Hyderabad, India.

Contradiction: Building support net to undergird and sustain the HDP beyond 1978. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Four Village Meeting dates are set. George Wambugu is invited to increase the amount of the proposal to Catholic Secretariat from 21,000 Kenyan shillings to 40,000. Ministry of Housing and Social Services takes ICA on visits to their projects, looking at the possibility of doing Village Meetings.

Internal: A great family celebration was held Saturday evening at Nairobi House.

Contradiction: Doing maneuvers in order to move effectively. (Wk. 1)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: High tea for 100 people is inkinded at the Taj Mahal Hotel with the replication school and Mrs. Vasant Rao Patil as chief guest. Proposal documents for the 24 projects are completed. Free spectacles for 250 villages are secured.

Internal: The birth of David Alexander (8lb 3oz) to John and Thea Patterson and the 30th birthday of Mario Yufomao are celebrated with singing and a feast.

Contradiction: Gearing total mobility into village replication back-up support system. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Continent meets for council in Maliwada and stands before a Maharashtra map with 36 talukas colored in-16 with staff and 20 more chosen.

Internal: House intensifies inkind, development and other systems for support of "the mighty 250!"

Contradiction: Locating the breakthrough miracle that will catalyze government authorization for the Mighty 250. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: The sewing industry begins production. The first harvest from the vegetable garden comes in. HDP submits a request for 50 toilets and begins the red tape involved in getting a hard surface on the road into the village.

Internal: The Quarter II battleplan is completed and now in operation, which was greatly assisted by two sojourners, Christian Mead and Prabode from the MHDTS.

Contradiction: Making guilds into actual working groups rather than planning and auxiliary accountability dynamic. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: H.S. Gavi, Bernard Rozario and Korgade are sent out to conduct Gram Sabha in Mahapoli village. The state transport authorities decide to extend bus services to Vaviharsh and to enable the health training school to be held in December. The district health officer visits Vaviharsh and makes arrangements for a doctor to visit weekly.

Internal: William Staples, Asaram Aswar and Terry Maver are received as auxiliary and M. Taksande is sent out as project director of the Shivni HDP, Russel Skinner is assigned to Temburwahi HDP. The auxiliary participates with the village in the Gaivesh Festival (the elephant god).

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers that will use the input of both village and auxiliary to finish the HDP in three months. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: President and officers of Akola Lions Club visit, bringing 50 slates and chalk for preschool and promising to return in October with citrus fruit trees for each family.

Internal: Four from auxiliary plus village preschool teacher go to Temburwahi for Gram Sabha. Steve Hamje arrives prior to Temburwahi HDP Consult.

Contradiction: Planning the event to re-engage villagers at end of monsoon season. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers, for the Demonstration Farm, Sanction of Parent Seed. Health Fair in village is great; Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city, attend. Clinic moves to new premises, larger with more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to the Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Presents proposal for piped water scheme to government authorities. Inaugurates village square. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village; sends two women to Malle Consult.

Internal: Sends Rose to Uit for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh.

Ragunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad, new auxiliary.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: Receives one quintel of hybrid jowar and cotton for the demonstration farm on June 30, 1977. The Agriculture University sends fertilizer, insecticide, and seeds. The next day one of the representatives of the university comes and gives guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary help in sowing seeds. Each house gets number, plus the community kitchen garden starts.

Internal: Shifts from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gives nice room for the project office in which the Uti HDP office is set up. This week many guests visit, one being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

Contradiction: Facing auxiliary and house problems. (Wk. 3)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Development intensification yields plates, cups, furniture, linen and Birla contact. Inkinding continues with several hotels, including the Oberoi Intercontinental. Helpful steps forward continue in national and state authorization for ensuing Delhi HDP. Four House members return from the Continental Council. Development exploration in Gwalior yields 2000 rupees.

Internal: The manager of the Maliwada Sukedi and Maliwada dairy come for a visit. Colleague Vijay Dethé enables pomfret fish fry celebration. House and cadre members attend the movie "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest."

Contradiction: Maneuvering without abandoning the base stronghold. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: The village is awl as the village "Panch" is elected. A fully-equipped children's park is created and the health clinic is readied.

Internal: The battleplanning session excites all with the possibility of the new quarter, marked by exit and arrivals of auxiliary staff.

Contradiction: Translating planning into action without losing momentum during troop transfers. (Wk. 1)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The feeling of the potential of GWF as a breakopen tool is confirmed by the initial contacts made with affluent womens' group in Calcutta.

Internal: Job hunting and house hunting for a permanent facility continue.

Contradiction: Providing the financial and residential base needed for supporting the move to a village HDP in eastern India. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Authorization continues to unblock Sungai Aup.

Internal: Welcomes the Gibsons and Andrew Knutsen enroute to Kuala Lumpur and all of the Sungai Aup House.

Contradiction: Getting set in the starting blocks after the starting gun has been fired. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP
External: Low-key village activity continues as the mid-point in the fasting month is reached, with the delivery of the first bamboo playhouse to Kuala Lumpur, publication of the Suara Sungai Lui, the roof added to the agricultural shed and preparation made for the water system.

Internal: Area priors meeting in Singapore demonstrates a new kind of globality and corporateness and symbolizes area expansion by setting dates for three HDP Consults and launching three new Houses.

Contradiction: Finding effective ways of village participation in midst of preparation for Hare Raya. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGGAI AUP HDP
External: Colleagues from East Malaysia visit about authorization maneuvers in Sarawak. September launch of Development maneuvers secures \$6,700.

Internal: Intensive battleplan for year tackled as Wiltse family shows up.

Contradiction: Forging clarity on the future of S.E. Asia and how the community dynamic will be supportive to it in the future. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP
External: Lebaron, the end of the fasting month celebration, is marked by key visits to local and national leaders. The second annual Labaron badminton tournament is self-supporting and creates great excitement among village youth. AFIA Insurance Company manages to visit and promises support through money and troops. The first stake meeting (253 present) after one month of fasting brings full representation from all stakes. The Industrial Guild decides to meet on Saturday weekly to include those who work in Jakarta. The soccer tournament is planned and run by the villagers. Literacy classes held every night in Dahung for the adult men is taught by a villager.

Internal: Staff journeys to Bogor for Lebaron celebration with Soehardi's family. Sepomo, friend of a staff member, sojourns for one month. A grand celebration is held for Connie, only she hasn't left yet due to passport problems. Kim Thornton, arrives for Development maneuver, Seize September.

Contradiction: Melding maneuvers into one thrust. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS
External: Two from Development Centrum go on Tokyo trek; key calls are made in Hong Kong. Nam Wai advisory council moves toward strong recommendation for a form of the Local Economic Vehicle for New Territories villages.

Internal: Corporate space is transformed with a decor blitz. House prepares for an intensive week of planning for the next quarter and year.

Contradiction: Getting hold of the coordination function required to maintain a corporate understanding of how everything fits together. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP
External: The advisory council, composed of village leaders, consenses on forming a development corporation of two companies. Preschool uniforms are inkinded. Two students join the staff for two days a week and inject vital catalysis for women in the village.

Internal: Loeppe family is sent out to Kansas City. The yearly timeline is completed after second Week II marathon.

Contradiction: Creating the models for the advisory council's economic perspective for human development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP
External: Guild meeting with 25 present results in committee to create village co-op and plan moon festival congress celebration. Creation of space map causes excitement as village decides where new structures need to be.

Internal: LaRoches arrive in the midst of quarter maneuver planning and all-island council with two villagers present.

Contradiction: Finding handholds for project intensification while organizing and enticing village into active task arenas. (Wk. 1).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE : MANILA
External: HDTS (Human Development Training School) development gets full commitment from private business for November school in Sudtonggan.

Internal: House Infant School in full swing and children in neighborhood school enable all troops to be on the road.

Contradiction: Jarring the world's time (chronos) with our time (kyros). (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI
External: After an island conference, four Hai Ou staff remain in Taipei for a few days and inkind one big and one small loudspeaker and one kilometer of wire.

Internal: Sojourners call their own meeting and raise their own monthly fee and arrange to do Emerging Generation curriculum while the school is closed due to flooding. Peter Hureceives invitation from Hong Kong for the HDP Consult and is busy raising funds.

Contradiction: Acting as an octopus with fingers in at least eight arenas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP
External: Land is donated for the Human Development Training School even before receiving final confirmation from India, and 37 are already registered. Sudtonggan has been nominated for a model village award. The first infant death of the year spurs nutrition/health campaign.

Internal: House planning for the quarter is completed with new decor. Mr. Louis Connick and Mr. Ben Contirray of the International Human Assistance Project visit for two days. Mr. Connick promises to help with reinstating CARE provisions to the island of Mactan, where he is on the Philippine board.

Contradiction: Intensifying training in all areas, particularly legal, to intensify economic thrust. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO
External: Visit to mayor Santos of Davao City produces official jeep, driver, and two guides for ten days to search the area for the Davao HDP site. Two from House go to Mati, Davao Oriental Province, for GCFs, marking the fifth province out of the 20 provinces in Mindanao to hold a GCF.

Internal: The Sun Tzu maneuver component screen allows all to accentuate advantages and focus efforts on the one maneuver, The Mount Apo Eruption Maneuver.

Contradiction: Coordinating the various activities so the advantage is in the right place at the right time. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO
External: Nippon Lever president, Mr. Tsusi, promises donation after completion of his trip to Europe with 30 other Japanese businessmen for trade negotiation tours.

Internal: Quarter maneuvers are written out of "Tokyo Aqueduct" image, focusing on supplying Oyubari with troops and developed funds, using the other impact and awakenment tools as building blocks.

Contradiction: Opening doors that are still shut after having done battleplanning. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Industrial procedures and budgets are finished and the Village Treasury assembly receives all instructions. Men women and bulldozer level ground for second chicken house. Health outpost celebrates its first month by self-support. Peace Corps volunteers visit for evaluation.

Internal: ICA inkind blackboard for developing children's school. Collegium on replication school pushes imaginations into the future.

Contradiction: Increasing replication momentum while waiting for directions from area council. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Three regional colleagues cover the office while staff is at area council and make calls for regional council. House finalizes set-up of Price Waterhouse LENS for November 18-20, 1977 in Seoul.

Internal: House is deeply addressed by collegium study of JWM's paper "What Hath Been Wrought."

Contradiction: Coordinating global scheduling of local events. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Whole House goes to area council in Oyubari. The guild begins Musashi study.

Internal: House celebrates the completion of maneuver writing with a yakatori feast. Jenkins family announces the coming birth of second child.

Contradiction: Releasing colleagues' time for the Movement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: October 20 date is set for Tokyo presentation of budget and documents to the government. GWF steering committee says over 80 women will attend a "housewives" forum on November 9. Korean colleagues visit Japanese Korean community for Kwangyung II development, finding the first Osaka ITI prospect at the Korean church. Invitations to sojourn in Oyubari impact colleagues, with three seriously considering.

Internal: Extended ecclesiola sodality gets out implementaries for maneuvers named at area council. Week II space maneuver sets stage for the work.

Contradiction: Living out of new possibility in midst of accustomed habit. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Colleagues are visited in Sapporo regarding contributing support of ICA work, receiving a three-month pledge from one with several others considering. Letter of endorsement arrives from Dr. Kitamura, faculty of engineering, Hokkaido University. Regional colleagues emerge to help with translation of guild meeting and other community activities. Completion of community activities center roof is great event. Dr. Itabashi of Fukushima cadre gives his consent to serve on ICA board of directors.

Internal: Job hunt releases new possibilities in Sapporo and private English student begins lessons at House. David Beal and Kent Tomlinson arrive. New song books are compiled.

Contradiction: Breaking loose creative moving amidst failure mentality of community leadership. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: In the midst of the preparation for wedding and area council troops are sent to the first area maneuver in

Adelaide. Research is continued for two new Aboriginal sites and United Nations Association of Australia conference is attended.

Internal: Intensive inkind blitz for area council is made as people come and go en route to global assignments, maneuvers, and Development PSU.

Contradiction: Putting form on the area council event so that the next year is launched with corporate intentionality and power. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: State housing commission responds to letter of invitation by deciding to send one to January Community Training Consultation.

Internal: House celebrates Harvey wedding; two wedding guests return for House Church the next day. Jean Smith visits, along with the Steeles, colleagues from Kalgoorlie visit.

Contradiction: Moving it in relation to Community Training Consultation and upcoming maneuver while maintaining job push. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Visit with Mayor of Wollongong, sixth largest city in Australia, elicits strong affirmation for doing CMAs in city and surrounding districts, in conjunction with Community Training Consultation (Summer Program) there.

Internal: Internal life teams, commissions, evening structures, etc., become operative, releasing all for quarter's engagement.

Contradiction: Building the momentum that propels rather than diffuses in initiating the quarter's maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Fresh milk daily from three new dairy cows supplies school children with milk. The cows are given bush names for three community women who share the same names with three auxiliary women. Trachoma team examines 173 patients. Local bank manager is impressed by his first visit to Oombulgurri. Two community women, Sheila and Elaine, are welcomed home from Jakarta ITI.

Internal: New decor reflects HDP completion. Collegium room is transformed into Guild Hall.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same degree of effectiveness despite the absence of some critical guildsmen. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: The first of five CMAs scheduled for one ten-day period is a great happening. Called the "Education Networks Community Meeting," the event impacts teachers from all over Adelaide with a fine set of materials on the application of the CMA workshop method in schools, creating the basis for a state schools campaign. Tea Tree Gully meeting decides to hold a CMA during the Week Eight maneuver, bringing the two-week maneuver tally to one held, four more set for next week, with three or four more possibilities still ripe. Decisions are made in Munno Para, Barossa Valley and Marion local government areas to hold 1 to 5 CMAs each in November.

Internal: House sends out Hamptons to Isle of Dogs, Wendy Saegenschnitter to Melbourne, receives John Rader from Darwin, and celebrates internship decision of Richard Charles at House Church of over fifty colleagues.

Contradiction: Putting flesh on the maneuver model in time for the maneuver. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNEs,

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Northern division logistics moves to Boston/Rochester for Week II. House attends celebration at Boston House Saturday p.m. of the first week of the maneuver.

Internal: House welcomes Elaine Vollrath as new intern at Sunday House Church. Youth cluster reports on year's goals and objectives at morning collegium. House Church with 21 persons is a great celebration, including ITI grad, Inyong Dhang, and his new wife from Korea, who live in Hartford and attend the Korean Methodist Church here.

Contradiction: Engaging metro circuiters in northern division campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: House visits seven new counties for Town Meeting and returns to three. Eight yeses are secured from 19 towns. Five metro folk participate in circuits. Sheraton Hotel is inkinded for Albany Assembly and paper and printing for 47,000 New York campaign flyers.

Internal: Significant meetings with metro colleagues on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday reveal deep willingness to take responsibility for campaign. as local forces pick up logistics task for New York Campaign.

Contradiction: Engaging residue of good will from previous campaigns. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: First real metro meeting since summer impacts colleagues with current total picture of the Movement and impacts House with the great number of years colleagues have been engaged in the Movement. Three TM circuiters report 21 dates set with firm yeses in 19 additional counties, signalling completion of coverage in New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Connecticut.

Internal: Circuiters celebrate Saturday night in Boston House's Paddy's Irish Tavern with Irish ale, witicisms, songs and revelry.

Contradiction: Building a detailed task plan to enable colleagues to engage in the task. (Wk. 1)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Combined teams from various task forces and House descend on Seaway for Week 11 circuits and impact local restaurant owner with corporate power; 25% of total communities visited in one day assure participation of all 10 counties in October Forum Days. French majorities push for bilingual Forums in Eastern Ontario as work continues in four counties for October 29 Forums.

Internal: Regional cross-pollination occurs as area colleagues play "Musical Houses." House is engaged on three fronts on Week II while Wayside Inn dynamic hosts two students from Brussels.

Contradiction: Maintaining the style and role of catalyzer to assure winning on all fronts at a time when each front cries

a blitz. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Regional colleague takes over leadership for Etobicoke Forum push.

Internal: Sends out Keller family. Jennifer Robins graduates to high school. More guests show up for House Church than House members, with all deciding to go to GRA and one to Lorne for summer.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum up for Etobicoke forums. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Workshop training and coordinator workshopping takes place in order to get 15 communities in Seaway into the CFC shoot for October 23 Forums in Leeds and Grenville counties.

Internal: In 1 ½ days, ten people, pack, move and store 50 boxes, 10 mattress, three chesterfields, and five tables in attic of Toronto House in midst of intense maneuver.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between pushing and waiting on communities for CFC. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Lieutenant Governor of province visits Lorne de L'Acadie and is impressed by community efforts to create anew and the maintaining of bilingual communication. Villagers raise money needed for cement to build fire hall by asking each family to donate \$2.62 or one bag of cement. Development raises \$21,000 in hand with \$38,000 more promised. New Day New Brunswick promotion team records three "spots" for radio and t.v. singing J'Y Serai in French and English. CHSJ-TV arrives unexpectedly to film the HDP. Remaneuvering leaves six to maintain HDP momentum while others join with area troops to bring off New Day New Brunswick's goal of 45 Forums in October.

Internal: House sends out 16 people who participated in three-week orientation program after answering ad. Going from 30 around table to eight impacts all as House prepares to receive back majority of the 16.

Contradiction: Creating possibility. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS-CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Two days of all-out major efforts on the part of the community, pouring cement floor and installing roofing, results in completion of new preschool structure. National Institute of Nutrition commences nutritional supplement program for preschoolers with the distribution of supplement products and instructional talk on food groups and balanced diets. Celebrative Saturday event inaugurates General Store in new site, completely equipped with cash register and new shelves.

Internal: Auxiliary welcomes Linda and Dorothy Martin, visitors from New York, who have decided to join HDP auxiliary staff for next few months.

Contradiction: Timing and celebrating events to ensure continued momentum in community participation. (Wk. 1)

WEEK ONE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum Singapore reports the first gift from the Perth Foundation which resulted from getting the tax number. Brussels reports the first general administration from Borg-Warner (Europe). Chicago reports that the Metro Circuits Patrol raised \$33,000 for the week which is \$6,000 behind the weekly target. Chicago reconfigured itself for Quarter II into Metro Circuits Patrol, Continental Regional Patrol, and Global Systems Patrol. The contradiction has to do with the rising taxes in several places and the rebuilding of the back-up systems in order to keep the cash coming into Centrum accounts.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that the Global Movement Academy began with international staff and participants from nine nations. Collegiums in Research Centrum on the Historical Church and the strategy for its re-engagement push all to examine the history-long, world-wide role of the church in relation to the campaigns and twenty-year vision. In the midst of many streams the Ecclesiola Manual was completed and mailed. The contradiction lies in maintaining focus in the creative breakthroughs that continue to surprise all.

GLOBAL OPERATION CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the launching of three acceleration "events," the creation of the GWF schedule for 14 GWFs in northeast Asia, 20 TMs held in North America with 156 of the projected 111 for this week in place, held or scheduled. The week's breakthrough has been in the arena of the increasing mobility and reconfiguration of Centrum troops with a multiplicity of assignments as special task forces that have been called in and out of being to move the campaigns forward. The key contradiction has to do with creating and integrating decor and maneuver working boards.

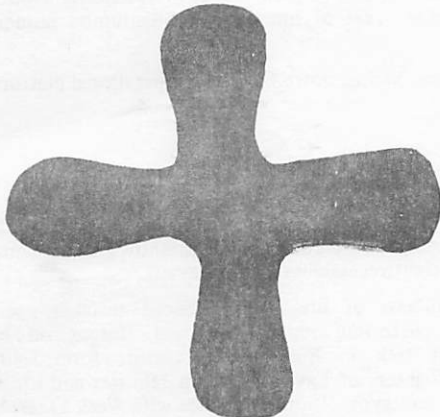
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Clancey Mann pursues legal legal issues with Brussels while on a business trip to Europe. Exciting recreation of Centrum space and inkinding linens and \$2,100 worth of cleaning supplies are significant happenings for Chicago. Clear needs of missional focus are chrystallizing in financial and legal arenas as the band reports come in. As the missional form continue to pull into focus, there is unclarity on how Management Centrum services the immediate particular demands.

External: Power house floor laid, with John Moore and Danny Nichols each working five solid hours. Project acquires good van for 85 pounds sterling and about 300 pounds worth of donated paint which is being used to brighten Cahir Street.

Internal: Resettlement completed and Guild Hall space redesigned to provide Daily Office space, collegium room and lounge.

Contradiction: Quickly establishing signs of winning that local people can point to. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development Centrum enables region to write development maneuvers for the year. Wales Maneuver document arrives and holds potential for Quarter II Scottish maneuvers.

Internal: Anne Conroy is sent out to be part of the staff for the Academy. Job search moves into interview phase.

Contradiction: Communicating the cruciality of the moral issue of the time to the 15%. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Exciting, affirmative visit with Cledwin Hughes, head of the Parliamentary Labor Party nets government authorization.

Internal: Spontaneous songfest bursts forth and lasts for two hours after House Church.

Contradiction: Maintaining a creative tension between local and global demands for time, troops and money. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Five from Harrogate join House for third regional planning and reporting session. Major commitment is given for GWF and launching of "Adopt a Village."

Internal: Lucy Smith joins Carroll and Jean in Wales Maneuver.

Contradiction: Establishing concrete commitment from the upsurge of enthusiasm of old and new colleagues. (Wk. 2)

Participation in Continental GWF pedagogy session kicks off planning for November 19 GWF in Paris; the GWF site in the Benedictine monastery next door is acquired for course use.

Internal: Moving into the new morning time design and collegium construct brings the discovery that two people can have a great collegium, daily office and breakfast. The arrival of Yvonne Guenec occasions space resettlement, and new guest room just in time.

Contradiction: Preparing House for winter in order to get on with the work. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME - TERMINE HDP

External: Mayor gives permission to use a room in the public school for a preschool. Young Terminese agrees to help set up and work in wood factory.

Internal: Religious House is "weatherproofed" after hints of cold weather indicate what winter may have in store when there is no central hearing and celebrates with wine and pizza in transformed lounge after day of shoveling and pick axing holes for trees.

Contradiction: How to coordinate travel to accomplish needs while located in a mountain village with one car. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: First coordinators' meeting held to structure and expand care of Ijedians broadens context of those working in specific programs and gives specific tasks to all. Development pushes toward inking essential services of electricity and water. The new Ijede map, done by a surveyor, helps lessen the confusion of Ijede paths.

Internal: All new auxiliary members have been initiated to Lagos go-slow.

Contradiction: Initiating new structures so that things do not fall through the cracks. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Calls in the Netherlands give great hope for major funding proposal.

Internal: The end-of-the-quarter celebration combines seeing "Bridge Too Far" with a midnight standup dinner.

Contradiction: Getting all systems full press before the quarter begins. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Reference to president of European Federation of Women opens new arenas of GWF. Letter arrives from young man who asks to be a volunteer for ICA in Belgium. Breakthrough comes in authorization with Flemish priest in San Gilles.

Internal: Two translators (French and Dutch) are working on GWF and GCF materials as creative interchange on Development and Town Meeting happens at area meeting.

Contradiction: Engaging local guides who will lead to community leadership. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Meeting of area task forces at Roosendaal enables Brussels to find new development leads and Amsterdam to find new Town Meeting possibilities.

Internal: Ecclesiola study on polity intensifies work done in last quarter's collegiums.

Contradiction: Using the limitations inherent in Town Meeting set-up in the Netherlands so that they become advantages. (Wk. 2)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Second edition of TM workbook is typed after excellent re-working by steering committee of June TM. After bracketing one community for the summer, ICA returns to find that they had been meeting by themselves for three weeks in preparation for October first TM.

Internal: Grand continental council reveals an unprecedented corporateness across the continent and reinforces conviction that present advantages and strategies call for pioneering with TM in urban communities.

Contradiction: Broadening the constituency of active steering committees. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Appointments relative to setting up a vocational training school and establishing a larger community meeting facility prove valuable in getting wheels turning in these arenas. Cafe training evening produces five ready to make ice cream specials and serve tables with sophistication. Saturday night newspaper collating party is punctuated with birthday celebration and dancing. German language class begins with two German and one Turkish on staff. Elders move from cafe to Centrum to begin work for Christmas.

Internal: Forest Craver arrives from Brussels for a week of Development and LEV (Local Economic Vehicle) planning. Three are sent to West Germany to orchestrate two GCFs.

Contradiction: Creating the system of reaching out for major

miracles in the midst of day-to-day programs. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: House full of grads eat, sing and send out three to the ITP in Chicago to join the fourth one already there. ITI report reveals 106 companies contributed over \$20,888 for this year's ITI. House secures facility for Bishop Thomas and receives full financial support for 22 church ITI participants.

Internal: Maneuvers for Quarter II emerge out of week of discontinuous time. 1976 grad and 1977 ITI staffer, Godfrey Mukosha begin year of intern. Two Shantumbu residents sojourn.

Contradiction: Nailing down Quarter II operational platform. (Wk. 2)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Village experiences successful test firing of bricks, pump house near completion and community garden planted with 13 different vegetables (first in Bayad).

Internal: Fullness of life is experienced through yearly planning, collegium report of Amal Marcos on her development trek in Europe and visitors from Cairo, including daughters of Egypt's Foreign Minister and Chile's Ambassador to Egypt. House celebrates with Week I feast by candlelight.

Contradiction: Finding the key to break loose local funding. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Three teams become block making and construction industry while fourth is hired by community to maintain market cleanliness. Dutch girl, agriculture student of Dr. Lanphear, joins in to apply dyke training to trickle irrigation scheme.

Internal: House sends out George Wambugu to Chicago Nexus assignment, first for a Kawangware Order member.

Contradiction: Enabling affirmative shift and stance for what is happening. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: High tea for 100 people is inked at the Taj Mahal Hotel with the replication school and Mrs. Vasantrao Patil as chief guest. Proposal documents for the 24 projects are completed. Free spectacles for 250 villages are secured.

Internal: The birth to David Alexander (8lb 3oz) to John and Thea Patterson and the 30th birthday of Mario Yufomao are celebrated with singing and a feast.

Contradiction: Gearing total mobility into village replication back-up support system. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: Continent meets for council in Maliwada and stands before a Maharashtra map with 36 talukas colored in-16 with staff and 20 more chosen.

Internal: House intensifies inked, development and other systems for support of "the mighty 250!"

Contradiction: Locating the breakthrough miracle that will catalyze government authorization for the Mighty 250. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR HDP

External: The sewing industry begins production. The first harvest from the vegetable garden comes in. HDP submits a request for 50 toilets and begins the red tape involved in getting a hard surface on the road into the village.

Internal: The Quarter II battleplan is completed and now in operation, which was greatly assisted by two sojourners, Christian Mead and Prabode from the MHDTS.

Contradiction: Making guilds into actual working groups rather than planning and auxiliary accountability dynamic. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH HDP

External: H.S. Gavi, Bernard Rozario and Korgade are sent out to conduct Gram Sabha in Mahapoli village. The state transport authorities decide to extend bus services to Vaviharsh and to enable the health training school to be held in December. The district health officer visits Vaviharsh and makes arrangements for a doctor to visit weekly.

Internal: William Staples, Asaram Aswar and Terry Maver are received as auxiliary and M. Taksande is sent out as project director of the Shivni HDP, Russel Skinner is assigned to Temburwahi HDP. The auxiliary participates with the village in the Gaivesh Festival (the elephant god).

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers that will use the input of both village and auxiliary to finish the HDP in three months. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: President and officers of Akola Lions Club visit, bringing 50 slates and chalk for preschool and promising to return in October with citrus fruit trees for each family.

Internal: Four from auxiliary plus village preschool teacher go to Temburwahi for Gram Sabha. Steve Hamje arrives prior to Temburwahi HDP Consult.

Contradiction: Planning the event to re-engage villagers at end of monsoon season. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers, for the Demonstration Farm, Sanction of Parent Seed. Health Fair in village is great; Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city, attend. Clinic moves to new premises, larger with more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to the Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Presents proposal for piped water scheme to government authorities. Inaugurates village square. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village; sends two women to Malle Consult.

Internal: Sends Rose to Uit for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. Welcomes Raganath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad, new auxiliary.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: Receives one quintel of hybrid jowar and cotton for the demonstration farm on June 30, 1977. The Agriculture University sends fertilizer, insecticide, and seeds. The next day one of the representatives of the university comes and gives guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary help in sowing seeds. Each house gets number, plus the community kitchen garden starts.

Internal: Shifts from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gives nice room for the project office in which the Uti HDP office is set up. This week many guests visit, one

being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

Contradiction: Facing auxiliary and house problems. (Wk. 3)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Development intensification yields plates, cups, furniture, linen and Birla contact. Inking continues with several hotels, including the Oberoi Intercontinental. Helpful steps forward continue in national and state authorization for ensuing Delhi HDP. Four House members return from the Continent Council. Development exploration in Gwalior yields 2000 rupees.

Internal: The manager of the Maliwada Sukedi and Maliwada dairy come for a visit. Colleague Vijay Deth enables pomfret fish fry celebration. House and cadre members attend the movie "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest."

Contradiction: Maneuvering without abandoning the base stronghold. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: The village is awhirl as the village "Panch ɛ is elected. A fully-equipped children's park is created and the health clinic is readied.

Internal: The battleplanning session excites all with the possibility of the new quarter, marked by exit and arrivals of auxiliary staff.

Contradiction: Translating planning into action without losing momentum during troop transfers. (Wk. 1)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The feeling of the potential of GWF as a breakopen tool is confirmed by the initial contacts made with affluent womens' group in Calcutta.

Internal: Job hunting and house hunting for a permanent facility continue.

Contradiction: Providing the financial and residential base needed for supporting the move to a village HDP in eastern India. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Cyril Evans, Deputy Director General of Health of Australia just back from Nam Wai, will set up air trips to 25 Northern Territory Aboriginal villages, allowing ICA to go in under health umbrella. Nine regional Guardian meetings are held to bring out 250 to complete Oombulgorri set-up. Melbourne holds first, with their trek scheduled.

Internal: Two crucial yeses come in for new location of House. Nexus warboard is built and working.

Contradiction: Bolstering systems in midst of "all systems go." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGA LUI HDP

External: Low-key village activity continues as the mid-point in the fasting month is reached, with the delivery of the first bamboo playhouse to Kuala Lumpur, publication of the Suara Sungai Lui, the roof added to the agricultural shed and preparation made for the water system.

Internal: Area priors meeting in Singapore demonstrates a new kind of globality and corporateness and symbolizes area expansion by setting dates for three HDP Consults and

three new Houses.

Contradiction: Finding effective ways of village participation in midst of preparation for Hare Raya. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Lebaron, the end of the fasting month celebration, is marked by key visits to local and national leaders. The second annual Lebaron badminton tournament is self-supporting and creates great excitement among village youth. AFIA Insurance Company manages to visit and promises support through money and troops. The first stake meeting (253 present) after one month of fasting brings full representation from all stakes. The Industrial Guild decides to meet on Saturday weekly to include those who work in Jakarta. The soccer tournament is planned and run by the villagers. Literacy classes held every night in Dahung for the adult men is taught by a villager.

Internal: Staff journeys to Bogor for Lebaron celebration with Soehardi's family. Sepomc, friend of a staff member, sojourns for one month. A grand celebration is held for Connie, only she hasn't left yet due to passport problems. Kim Thornton arrives for Development maneuver, Seize September.

Contradiction: Melding maneuvers into one thrust. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nexus goes on development calling in Hong Kong.

Internal: Centrum maneuver is planned for year. Quarter I ending is marked with celebration with Indonesian meal and dancing to Filipino band.

Contradiction: Keeping Houses and ICA commitments afloat financially while getting self-support and development underway. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The advisory council, composed of village leaders, consenses on forming a development corporation of two companies. Preschool uniforms are inkinded. Two students join the staff for two days a week and inject vital catalysis for women in the village.

Internal: Loeppke family is sent out to Kansas City. The yearly timeline is completed after second Week II marathon.

Contradiction: Creating the models for the advisory council's economic perspective for human development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Villagers come out to work on the community stage by the temple even to the point of paying for labor because of the rice harvest. One thousand (New Taiwanese) dollars is donated by the Temple Committee toward the building of the stage.

Internal: New welcome sign and repair shop sign are painted. Pat Despain is sent out to land key self support job for project at Taipei American School, and to be link between Taipei and Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Tying vision for the community with the community's vision. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE : MANILA

External: Development raises 24,000 pesos from Philacor (Westinghouse) for two ICA staff stipends, training, and coordination expenses at Sudtonggan HDP for one year.

Internal: House inkinds Philippine Air Force flight to Sudtonggan Fair, October 2, and returns in war-troop-filled

cargo jet via Cotabato and Zamboanga.

Contradiction: Finding the story that will release immediate cash flow. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: After an island conference, four Hai Ou staff remain in Taipei for a few days and inkind one big and one small loudspeaker and one kilometer of wire.

Internal: Sonojourners call their own meeting and raise their own monthly fee and arrange to do Emerging Generation curriculum while the school is closed due to flooding. Peter Su receives invitation from Hong Kong for the HDP Consult and is busy raising funds.

Contradiction: Acting as an octopus with fingers in at least eight arenas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Lester and Tito are sent out on first GCF treks for seven days, travelling by boat and bus. They visit four metros, setting up GCFs and training sessions. Iloilo Regional Director invites ICA to do project and provides a jeep which will guarantee transportation to all public services. Ten are secured for Human Development Training School. Bishops Businessmens: Conference in Iloilo sponsors GCF.

Internal: Bill Bliss of Maine and Philadelphia walks in unannounced during ecclesiola to spend the quarter and House receives three additional sojourners for month.

Contradiction: Keeping the story up to date in the midst of a rapidly changing missional context. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: One-week circuit completes three GCFs in Mati totaling 700 participants at a total cost of \$800 and brings in \$1,000 program income. Four full days are spent travelling around Davao city and Davao Delnorte province (1,600 kilometers) entirely hosted by the major, governor and councillors in our search for the Davao project site. Judy Albers is sent out from Mati to Sudtonggan Fair.

Internal: Shifting data allows all to practice the necessity of contingency models in the art of maneuver without losing a step. Reflection on site visits reveals concrete signs needed in rural villages. Women drop by to sign up for a month's sojourn and attend House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping commitments straight in the midst of continual remaneuvering. (Wk. 2)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: House develops \$600 in one week. A circuit design was formed to impact 20 communities with possiblility of Chiikikandankai (TM) before Week 4.

Internal: Schedules are laid out for permeation to fulfill budget needs.

Contradiction: Getting all the shoulders through the door at once. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: This was a week of constant movement: the Health Outpost and the Trading Post were moved to new sites this week. Community workers moved the Trading Post lock,stock and bartel to a section of the Commons House and increased their stock and sales appreciably. Trading Post now has a contract with the Primary School to supply all food and eggs for the School Lunch Program. The week's gross sales rose from 12,000 to 30,000 won per day, plus income from the School Lunch program. The Health Outpost was visited

interested nurses from local Jung Ju Hospital. The KY-HOP has been authorized by the Jeju Dept. of Health and Social Welfare to dispense small doses of common medicines without the need for a registered nurse present, a giant step up for the local health care workers. Walls and roof studs for the second chicken house are up with the aid of local village labor only.

Internal: Kwangyung auxiliary staff went to Tokyo Area council in Oyubari, Japan for planning.

Contradiction: Relating to the village leaders. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Whole House goes to area council in Oyubari. The guild begins Musashi study.

Internal: House celebrates the completion of maneuver writing with a yakatori feast. Jenkins family announces the coming birth of second child.

Contradiction: Releasing colleagues' time for the Movement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Enthusiastic ITI grad in Naka asks about the programs which can be held as soon as possible.

Internal: Inkind blackboard arrives as decor goes up. One House member is flown to Osaka for teachers training and the the company pays the tab.

Contradiction: Releasing effective troop scheduling. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Global Womens Forum set-up work uncovers many Oyubari women who have been waiting for an opportunity to get involved in the project. Regional colleagues volunteer to come and act as bi-lingual staff for evenings and week-ends. Visit from Tourist Company Colleagues from Tokyo prompts Tourist Industry PSU.

Internal: House floor painting is completed with no serious accidents and only one morning of coming close to denying that "life is good." House celebrates end-of-quarter by leading World-wide Communion service followed by an afternoon movie and evening pizza.

Contradiction: Focusing general invitation for engagement. (Wk. 2)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: In the midst of the preparation for wedding and area council, troops are sent to the first area maneuver in Adelaide. Research is continued for two new Aboriginal sites and United Nations Association of Australia conference is attended.

Internal: Intensive inkind blitz for area council is made as people come and go en route to global assignments, maneuvers, and Development PSU.

Contradiction: Putting form on the area council event so that the next year is launched with corporate intentionality and power. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Recruitment for Summer (CTC) continues with visits to Physical Education Department of University and state office of Bank of New South Wales which brings referral to their national headquarters.

Internal: Neil Rees returns from hospital, without appendix, in time to hear reports of tremendous end of quarter celebration, riding bicycles over the hills of Rottneast Island and to see colorful decor of warroom for GCF maneuver (Operation Wildflower).

Contradiction: Breaking open the tension between building complete models and getting on the road. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Visit with Mayor of Wollongong, sixth largest city in Australia, elicits strong affirmation for doing CMAs in city and surrounding districts, in conjunction with Community Training Consultation (Summer Program) there.

Internal: Internal life teams, commissions, evening structures, etc., become operative, releasing all for quarter's engagement.

Contradiction: Building the momentum that propels rather than diffuses in initiating the quarter's maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Fresh milk daily from three new dairy cows supplies school children with milk. The cows are given bush names for three community women who share the same names with three auxiliary women. Trachoma team examines 173 patients. Local bank manager is impressed by his first visit to Oombulgurri. Two community women, Sheila and Elaine, are welcomed home from Jakarta ITI.

Internal: New decor reflects HDP completion. Collegium room is transformed into Guild Hall.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same degree of effectiveness despite the absence of some critical guildsmen. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Development circuits are set up with 12 appointments before the Area Donor Circuit team arrives. Mass awakening event is held in the Barossa Valley with the Jaycees, resulting in their decision to hold a Community Meeting. Kathy Oakley and Frank Brenner's visit schools commission concerning \$1,000 grant for youth trek to Oombulgurri.

Internal: House sends Joan Priest out to maneuver with "Operation Oh Yes!" in Melbourne and sends Bronwyn Rees out to Melbourne en route to Termine HDP.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers that do the three campaigns. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: First week of three-in-one maneuver is named "Victory in Victoria." One mass awakening event in Prahran High School is completed with nine more to go; 25 Guardiangather to decide to "move it" to get Oombulgurri workshop completed before end of October. Major charitable foundation agrees to support Aboriginal Community Meetings and selection of two new sites.

Internal: Tony Allan begins two-week sojourn in midst of fantastic maneuver activities.

Contradiction: Funding maneuvering expenses. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Visit with the director of women's affairs for Asia/Pacific, Elizabeth Reid, of the United Nations, results in her decision to attend a consult. She wants ICA to submit proposals in 1978 to the UN. ICA attends a key luncheon with foreign affairs person who screens and decides proposals is interested in a consult as well. Area Sydney Development, CMA and Guardian thrusts begin, as well as OHDP expansion.

Internal: Singapore Centrum Nexus at Canberra holds corporate conversations with Singapore location regarding single thrust.

Contradiction: Being aware of three area quarterly battleplan regarding how to serve. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Colleagues come in for 7:00 a.m. countdown meeting as only 50 hours away from first grade set up of community meeting. Ligtermoets arrive to help as Henny gets fruit from two markets in the community Arca. Inkind goods come in. Fifty assignable people work on set-up and

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Two are sent out to Saskatoon for weekend's re-maneuvering with the two other prairie circuit teams.

Internal: Duffy gets driver's licence and youth cluster keeps House structures going full speed while most adults are away.

Contradiction: Finding ways to celebrate the victory of the quarter in order to engage the new quarter. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

Contradiction: Engaging metro circuiters in northern division campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: House visits seven new counties for Town Meeting and returns to three. Eight yeses are secured from 19 towns. Five metro folk participate in circuits. Sheraton Hotel is inkinded for Albany Assembly and paper and printing for 47,000 New York campaign flyers.

Internal: Significant meetings with metro colleagues on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday reveal deep willingness to take responsibility for campaign, as local forces pick up logistics task for New York Campaign.

Contradiction: Engaging residue of good will from previous campaigns. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: First real metro meeting since summer impacts colleagues with current total picture of the Movement and impacts House with the great number of years colleagues have been engaged in the Movement. Three TM circuiters report 21 dates set with firm yeses in 19 additional counties, signalling completion of coverage in New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Connecticut.

Internal: Circuiters celebrate Saturday night in Boston House's Paddy's Irish Tavern with Irish ale, witticisms, songs and revelry.

Contradiction: Building a detailed task plan to enable colleagues to engage in the task. (Wk. 1)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Combined teams from various task forces and House descend on Seaway for Week 11 circuits and impact local restaurant owner with corporate power; 25% of total communities visited in one day assure participation of all 10 counties in October Forum Days. French majorities push for bilingual Forums in Eastern Ontario as work continues in four counties for October 29 Forums.

Internal: Regional cross-pollination occurs as area colleagues play "Musical Houses." House is engaged on three fronts on Week II while Wayside Inn dynamic hosts two students from Brussels.

Contradiction: Maintaining the style and role of catalyzer to assure winning on all fronts at a time when each front cries for a blitz. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Regional colleague takes over leadership for Etobicoke Forum push.

Internal: Sends out Keller family. Jennifer Robins graduates to high school. More guests show up for House Church than House members, with all deciding to go to GRA and one to Lorne for summer.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum up for Etobicoke forums. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Workshop training and coordinator workshopping takes place in order to get 15 communities in Seaway into the CFC shoot for October 23 Forums in Leeds and Grenville counties.

Internal: In 1 1/2 days, ten people, pack, move and store 50 boxes, 10 mattress, three chesterfields, and five tables in attic of Toronto House in midst of intense maneuver.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between pushing and waiting on communities for CFC. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Lieutenant Governor of province visits Lorne de L'Acadie and is impressed by community efforts to create anew and the maintaining of bilingual communication. Villagers raise money needed for cement to build fire hall by asking each family to donate \$2.62 or one bag of cement. Development raises \$21,000 in hand with \$38,000 more promised. New Day New Brunswick promotion team records three "spots" for radio and t.v. singing J'Y Serai in French and English. CHSJ-TV arrives unexpectedly to film the HDP. Remaneuvering leaves six to maintain HDP momentum while others join with area troops to bring off New Day New Brunswick's goal of 45 Forums in October.

Internal: House sends out 16 people who participated in

orientation program after answering ad. Going from 30 around table to eight impacts all as House prepares to receive back majority of the 16.

Contradiction: Creating possibility. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS-CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Cano Negro makes it to press as exemplary organized Community Development Project selected for one day visit (Sept. 25) by international labor and church leaders' conference. Venezuelan Minister of Environment and Renewable Resources writes extensive general letter of recommendation on basis of Cano Negro HDP. Community makes strides in leadership roles as principal health caretaker takes charge of dispensary area clean-up work day, manager of newly established general store places her first replenishment order with supplier, and another young community leader entirely directs leaders' planning session.

Internal: Newly arrived auxiliary staff JoAnn Gammel, Kenyon Wilson and John Reese are assigned to their guilds while entire staff enjoys refreshing end-of-quarter discontinuity in Caracas.

Contradiction: Establishing the symbolic foundations to sustain practical leadership training and community engagement. (Wk. 2)

In the midst of many streams the Ecclesiola Manual was completed and mailed. The contradiction lies in maintaining focus in the creative breakthroughs that continue to surprise all.

Global Operations Centrum reports the launching of three acceleration "events," the creation of the GWF schedule for 14 GWFs in northeast Asia, 20 TMs held in North America with 156 of the projected 111 for this week in place, held or scheduled. The week's breakthrough has been in the arena of the increasing mobility and reconfiguration of Centrum troops with a multiplicity of assignments as special task forces that have been called in and out of being to move the campaigns forward. The key contradiction has to do with creating and integrating decor and maneuver working boards.

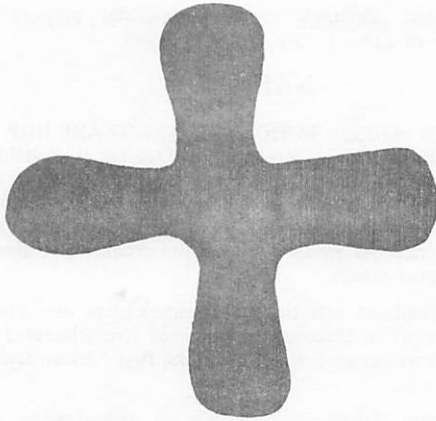

External: House hosts colleagues in all-day regional planning session and begins sometime painful process of consensing on the regional priorities.

Internal: Colleagues show up at the first of the Tuesday night planning sessions as call comes from Edinburgh asking how to help in the ICA programs.

Contradiction: Maintaining ICA transparent servant role. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Five out of the eight counties in Wales have Town Meetings on the way.

Internal: David Cunningham arrives from Dundee for internship as fast ends with fine Chinese feast.

Contradiction: Developing funds from Town Meeting Wales campaign in order to keep maneuver troops on the road. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Five from Harrogate join House for third regional planning and reporting session. Major commitment is given for GWF and launching of "Adopt a village."

Internal: Lucy Smith joins Carroll and Jean in Wales Maneuver.

Contradiction: Establishing concrete commitment from the upsurge of enthusiasm of old and new colleagues. (W. 2)

External: Networks begin to work for the project as president of the Chamber of Commerce sets up visit with key funding agency official who decides to visit project site.

Internal: Italian Guardian couple visit Termine and help celebrate "Festa" by cooking an incredible feast.

Contradiction: Keeping project story alive in village when most work and breakthroughs are taking place many miles away. (Wk. 3)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Twenty community leaders pitch in to prepare for visit of CIDA (NGO) representative who makes individual donation of \$35 to the project. Children's Institute Board of Governors is nominated at coordinators' meeting. Electrification Committee is chosen. All four ward boundaries are finalized.

Internal: Tajudeen Oqunbiyi is released from job in Lagos to intern and prepares to attend HDTS in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Focusing project thrust in the midst of 100 crucial tactics. (Wk. 3)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Two Development circuits in the U.K. and Berlin and Management trek to Amsterdam get all on the road.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS)

Internal: Visit of global priors en route to India brings global news and new sense of the global band becoming an active reality.

Contradiction: Formulating a band interface which unblocks regional operations amidst ambiguities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: TM endorsement for Dorpsdag received from National Secretary of "Year of the Village" opens the way for government funding for all Flemish TMs and national networks.

Internal: House hosts Guardians Meeting.

Contradiction: Moving an authorization "yes" into Town Meetings. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Eight Nederlanders attend Guardians Meeting in Brussels and are deeply addressed by collegiality with fellow Europeans.

Internal: Connie Widyatma finally arrives!

Contradiction: Creating images of master strategy which hold maneuvers together as one thrust. (Wk. 3)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The first suburban community decides to have a TM. Twelve key community leaders are present at one meeting. In the Ruhr Valley a group of 16 women decide to have a 70-participant GWF on November 19. Steering committee meetings are held in Ratingen West and the inner city of Heidelberg. In Friemersheim the follow-up evaluation meeting is held with a celebrative meal.

Internal: House works out a development plan with Forest Craver and Management Trek from Brussels goes through finances and other Management issues.

Contradiction: Tapping the engagement potential of Movement and House. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Appointments relative to setting up a vocational training school and establishing a larger community meeting facility prove valuable in getting wheels turning in these arenas. Cafe training evening produces five ready to make ice cream specials and serve tables with sophistication. Saturday night newspaper collating party is punctuated with birthday celebration and dancing. German language class begins with two German and one Turkish on staff. Elders move from cafe to Centrum to begin work for Christmas.

Internal: Forest Craver arrives from Brussels for a week of Development and LEV (Local Economic Vehicle) planning. Three are sent to West Germany to orchestrate two GCFs.

Contradiction: Creating the system of reaching out for major miracles in the midst of day to day programs. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: House full of grads eat, sing and send out three to the ITP in Chicago to join the fourth one already there. ITI report reveals 106 companies contributed over \$20,888 for this year's ITI' House secures facility for Bishop Thomas and receives full financial support for 22 church ITI participants.

Internal: Maneuvers for Quarter II emerge out of week of discontinuous time. 1976 grad and 1977 ITI staffer, Godfrey Mukosha begins year of intern. Two Shantumbu residents sojourn.

Contradiction: Nailing down Quarter II operational platform. (Wk. 2)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Local development gets off the ground with five yeses to pledges from businesses in Cairo. Of 104 babies weighed, only three did not gain weight this month. Antibiotics and five cases of milk for infants are inkinded. Sample galabeyas are sent to Dutch market.

Internal: After eight months of work, Nagi Wahib wins year off from government service to intern with the project.

Contradiction: Securing adequate financial support for completion of project. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: First Village Meeting for Quarter II is held in Kabiro, stake five of KHDP. All-African circuit team sets up four Village Meeting dates in Kitui. The Kawangware Youth Corps is now totally self-supporting. Fourteen new strawberry varieties are received for the urban farm, nine of them of export variety.

Internal: Wambugu gets ticket and enters plane one minute before take-off to Chicago and three of five scheduled for Maliwada Replication School, including first African family, wing it to India.

Contradiction: Turning coagulation of authorization into strong base for moving ahead. (Wk. 3)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: High tea for 100 people is inkinded at the Taj Mahal Hotel with the replication school and Mrs. Vasantrao Patil as chief guest. Proposal documents for the 24 projects are completed. Free spectacles for 250 villages are secured.

Internal: The birth of David Alexander (8lb 3oz) to John and Thea Patterson and the 30th birthday of Mario Yufomao are celebrated with singing and a feast.

Contradiction: Gearing total mobility into village replication back-up support system. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Greaves Cotton Company promises to sponsor Kendur Project with 300,000 rupees (\$34,500). Inkind team collects mountain of cloths, especially uniforms, from Bombay hotel president.

Internal: The Wayside Inn hosts the urban recruitment staff, the economic commission, the inkind troops from the School and the troops from Vaviharsh and Mahapoli.

Contradiction: Creating the practical models for effectively engaging the troops in the battleplan for Quarter II. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Preschool gets a boost with tables and toys under construction, milk for lunch, recruitment of three teacher trainees and monthly baby weighing in all stakes. Youth program leaps to 100 school-age children three times a week. The making of chalk, soap, incense and candles are demonstrated as possible small industries.

Internal: David and Cyprian visit birefly between state financial duties and new site selections, boosting spirits in the midst of steady rainfall.

Contradiction: Catalyzing a major economic miracle. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP
External: Government sanctions 60,000 rupees (\$6,900) for building of community center and teachers' quarters. Authorities say yes to request for dam water for sprinkle irrigation system.

Internal: Auxiliary experiments with early morning shramdan (volunteer labor) following third act of morning ritual.

Contradiction: Picking up on village enthusiasm for taking over responsibility in the midst of the demands of preparing for the harvest. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP
External: President and officers of Akola Lions Club visit, bringing 50 slates and chalk for preschool and promising to return in October with citrus fruit trees for each family.

Internal: Four from auxiliary plus village preschool teacher go to Temburwahi for Gram Sabha. Steve Hamje arrives prior to Temburwahi HDP Consult.

Contradiction: Planning the event to re-engage villagers at end of monsoon season. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP
External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (work day) on repairing old temple, steps, cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara District capital city. Completes village census and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and inkind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden is prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James, arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Channeling some of raw enthusiasm and energy to procuring materials and other input that will transform work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UPI-UTI HDP
External: Receives one quintel of hybrid jowar and cotton for the demonstration farm on June 30, 1977. The Agriculture University sends fertilizer, insecticide, and seeds. The next day one of the representatives of the university comes and gives guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary help in sowing seeds. Each house gets number, plus the community kitchen garden starts.

Internal: Shifts from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gives nice room for the project office in which the Uti HDP office is set up. This week many guests visit, one being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

Contradiction: Facing auxiliary and house problems. (Wk. 3)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI
External: Many of India's leading industrial and political figures are impacted by HDP stories as staff circuit in Agra, Jaipur, Gwalior and Delhi. Marie Paul meets the Maharani and her son His Highness of Gwalior.

Internal: Swirls of guests, Order members and auxiliary coming and going freshens the missional context.

Contradiction: Focussing the enthusiasm of colleagues into actual set-up of Gram Sabhas and attendance at the HDTs in Maliwada. (Wk. 3)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP
External: Village elects eight members to the Panchayat.

Average yield for dry land farm demonstration of hybrid jowar (sorghum) is three tons per acre (average ear weighs 370 grams) - seven to eight times the normal yield.

Internal: A fantastic celebration of Gandhi's birthday is highlighted by the participation of over 50 girls and women in rangoli competition.

Contradiction: Engaging larger numbers of local people to implement subactics. (Wk.3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA
External: The feeling of the potential of GWF as a breakopen tool is confirmed by the initial contacts made with affluent womens' group in Calcutta.

Internal: Job hunting and house hunting for a permanent facility continue.

Contradiction: Providing the financial and residential base needed for supporting the move to a village HDP in eastern India. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS
External: Nexus signals new beginnings by sending Wiltse and Lush out on Management trek and Stanley to Kuala Lumpur for development.

Internal: Joel Mitchell and Dixie Jennings-Teats arrive and are welcomed to Area Singapore assignments as Doug Curtis is sent out to Apia assignment.

Contradiction: Enabling missional thrust now while waiting for Nexus meeting with Canberra scheduled for next week. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGGAI AUP HDP
External: Colleagues from East Malaysia visits about authorization maneuvers in Sarawak. September launch of Development maneuvers secures \$6,700.

Internal: Intensive battleplan for year tackled as Wiltse family shows up.

Contradiction: Forging clarity on the future of S.E. Asia and how the Centrum dynamic will be supportive to it in the future. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP
External: Another bamboo playhouse orders 65 tadika (kindergarten) students. Parents and teachers have an amazing trip to the zoo. Guardians and potential donors visit project. Lions Club votes to pay for water system and new preschool building. Villagers take more and more responsibility.

Internal: House is spiritized as the collegium room is painted and redecored.

Contradiction: Forming alternative models to get the task done when weather disrupts weekly timeline. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP
External: Lebaron, the end of the fasting month celebration, is marked by key visits to local and national leaders. The second annual Labaron badmidton tournament is self-supporting and creates great excitement among village youth. AFIA Insurance Company manages to visit and promises support through money and troops. The first stake meeting (253 present) after one month of fasting brings full representation from all stakes. The Industrial Guild decides to meet on Saturday weekly to include those who work in Jakarta. The soccer tournament is planned and run by the villagers. Literacy classes held every night in Dahung for the adult men is taught by a villager.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP)
Internal: Staff journeys to Bogor for Lebaron celebration with Soehardi's family. Sepomo, friend of a staff member, sojourns for one month. A grand celebration is held for Connie, only she hasn't left yet due to passport problems. Kim Thornton arrives for Development maneuver, Seize September.

Contradiction: Melding maneuvers into one thrust. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS
External: Nexus goes on development calling in Hong Kong.
Internal: Centrum maneuver is planned for year. Quarter I ending is marked with celebration with Indonesian meal and dancing to Filipino band.

Contradiction: Keeping Houses and ICA commitments afloat financially while getting self-support and development underway. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP
External: Nam Wai project presentation is made to District Officers of the New Territories including a beautiful pictorial presentation given by Hong Kong architect who is local Guardian. This was the first step toward replication in the New Territories.

Internal: House starts new quarter with a fine Ecclesiola celebration with local Guardian present who said it was good to be back in the swing of things after a long summer.

Contradiction: Molding positive responses to concrete action that will fulfill completion criteria. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP
External: Minister of Communications authorizes free telephone for Hai Ou. Testing begins on adobe brick mixture and 4,000 1-K bricks are delivered. New Hai Ou welcome sign is put up.

Internal: Macomber, Hu, Janice Barstow and Miss Wang (Kaohsiung Cooperative Farmers Association) visit.

Contradiction: Looking ahead beyond immediate tasks while pushing to complete visible signs. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE : MANILA
External: House completes two-week corporation development blitz with net promises equaling last year's total developed funds and half of this month's goal in hand.

Internal: House attends feast of Our Lady of Fatima parish culminating week of community celebrations and festivities.

Contradiction: Keeping programs in stride with support systems. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI
External: A letter from the Ministry of Communications of the national government arrives granting permission for a telephone to be established in Hai Ou. The \$5000 (US) installation is inked. Team is sent to Hai Ou for TM strategy planning. Taipei Rotarians set to work on investment prospects for Hai Ou industries.

Internal: Planning weekend for year and Quarter II works on assignments, TM brief, ICA brochure translation, year-long task images, movement formation and House decor.

Contradiction: Corporately moving through careful planning and training in the midst of many task demands. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU - SUDTONGGAN HDP
External: Sudtonggan Fair with 200 guests from Lapu Lapu and Cebu heralds beginning of economic marketing

campaign. The opening of the Health Clinic (with quail that will provide 70 eggs a day for infant nutrition program) and power plant together with new contracts for rope and cut stone are signs of the future. Vice President of Manila corporation arrives to spend two weeks designing systems for craft industry and initiates eight to five work day.

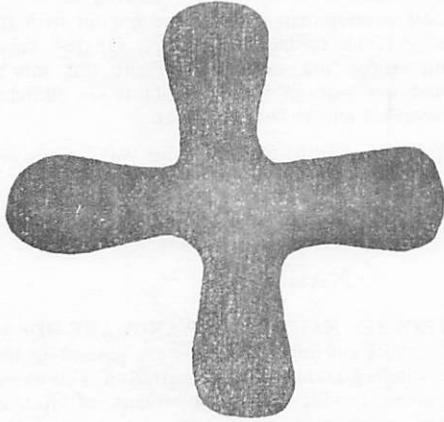

External: Victory is claimed at the beginning of the week and the Development blitz for Town Meeting is a success with 150 appointments; 21 people participate during the week and a potential of \$26,000 in hand in the near future.

Internal: A celebrative candlelight meal highlights the day's accomplishments and demonstrates the power of discontinuous shifts in time design when engaging in short term special maneuvers.

Contradiction: Dealing with the "fine at the start but left with a heart that is breaking" syndrome in the arena of follow-up strategies after successful breakopen. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Burst of regional activity happens as six go to 13th Guardians Consult two to GWF in Indianapolis, and eight (including Marge Philbrook and youth) help in relocation.

Internal: St. Louis finds a new House as reluctant landlord gets intrigued and decides \$100 a month is enough.

Contradiction: Catching up. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: South Des Moines Chamber of Commerce decides to back South Des Moines Town Meeting on November 12.

Internal: House sends Leah Dunbar back to Chicago to prepare for India assignment.

Contradiction: Laying the groundwork for major push on state assembly in the winter while doing all the nitty gritty of several TMs this fall. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Town Meeting in L'Anse-Baraga turns Upper Michigan one county yellower.

Internal: House and eight colleagues travel to Mathews funeral in Chicago.

Contradiction: Focusing House time to maximize troop time across the metro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Mequon UMC and St. Christophers Episcopal churches adopt Indian Villages.

Internal: Leathermans begin 26 week two-week sojourn mode. Someone from the metro is in the House every week for 26 weeks.

Contradiction: harnessing all the wealth and energy in the bi-metro. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Three day-long TMs held in Kendallville, Huntington, and Ft. Wayne launch Town Meeting: Indiana with 170 in attendance. Louisville and Lafayette Cadres meet Monday night to strategize on TM and RS-I and have White and Vermillion counties moving nicely. Initial yeses in both Hancock and Hamilton counties look good too.

Internal: Twelve House and metro colleagues journey to Chicago to celebrate the completed life of Joseph Wesley Mathews.

Contradiction: Creating timelines that manipulate time so that 10 more TMs get done before the "Christmas mindset" takes over. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House team of two spends three days in far reaches of the territory to find local man looking for community responsibility and involvement. Planning for 1977 TM brochure is begun.

Internal: Job search continues and renters are anticipated by November.

((RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI))

Contradiction: Realizing that the task is never complete while sensing the earth moving under foot. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Seven guardians go to Chicago for the 13th Guardians Consult and three to Indianapolis for the GWF; six more counties are colored yellow.

Internal: New job enables House to move beyond budget immediacies; House hosts ten neighborhood people at Avalon block club.

Contradiction: Subsidizing small town Town Meetings. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The first evening Town Meeting is scheduled for Thursday night with everything ready to go in one week. Incredible Saturday blitz includes 15 community citizens and resulted in posters on every corner, brochures in every home and speeches or phone calls to organizations and churches.

Internal: House initiates metro circuits by meeting with colleagues for dinner in each of three polis groups.

Contradiction: Remembering to ask for colleagues' engagement. (Wk. 3)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Lower East Side New York TM pays ICA fee for TM held last spring.

Internal: Week-long vigil and prayer sessions are held to celebrate the life and death of JWM.

Contradiction: Deciding what is necessary to do this week in massive TM campaign in order to win in November. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Metro circuit dynamic continues with visit to Hakel and McKnight families in the Erie metro; House joins area in Washington D.C. to celebrate Ivy City's first anniversary.

Internal: Carlos Ollison announces Joseph Mathew's death at the conclusion of House Church in Ivy City; The trip home is filled with reflections on the gifts of past, present collegiality and common work and the fullness of the future.

Contradiction: Globalizing and mobilizing available metro troops to join the great campaigns which for the moment are being waged on distant fronts. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Town Meetings now are in the chute for 13 of 14 counties of Operation Lake Fronts (Western New York State).

Internal: House participates in Ivy City anniversary celebration.

Contradiction: Keeping the ship afloat while holding training session on a slippery deck. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Thomas Jefferson University is secured as Southern theater assembly site. Town Meeting advocates (those whose names appear on the brochure) meet and decide to provide more support to development effort.

Internal: House reaches full employment.

Contradiction: Staging the opportunities for contexting the troops which will release the GSF. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: Ivy City is impacted by eight block workday as five blocks work without auxiliary assistance. Two garages are

filled with inkind vinyl covered wall board. Alexander Crummel Hall is created by area troops. Four day yearly battleplanning with large community participation kicks off year of acceleration. Community celebrates first graduation of three preschoolers to first grade with 150 people attending ceremony and reception.

Internal: Experiences end of summer comings and goings with massive House Church send-out just before arrival of Samurai Development Team and Kwangyung II village leader, Kim Bong Joon and Saemaul leader, Koh Yang Hae, on tour of US and HDPs with Korean colleague Sung Chul.

Contradiction: Trusting the shadow principle as the key dynamic in getting all the plates spinning for the coming year. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: This week yields three new commitments to circuiting for the Town Meeting Campaign.

Internal: House procures the community recreation center and printing facilities in preparation for logistic/debriefing weekend.

Contradiction: Enabling colleagues to see they are the Spirit Movement not that the Spirit Movement is something to get involved in. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Global Servant meeting brings forth new declarations from the local people for support of ICA programs.

Internal: Area prior's presence impacts House with Global Social Demonstration by latest update of Ivy City HDP.

Contradiction: Releasing all of the Global Servant Force to see that care for the globe is care for the local. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Area conjures in Ivy City for celebration of the completion of first year of project. Newark Cadre begins to recruit New Jersey jost committees and assembly participants to be trained as orchestrators; 200 as targeted.

Internal: The area, gathered in House Church at Ivy City, receives word of the completion of Joseph's life beginning week of celebration with nightly vigil and concludes Thursday night with reading of JWM's "The Day My father Died."

Contradiction: Asking the right questions to allow a focus on the necessary logistics which will allow the area campaign to move through the assemblies on to the wins of Quarter. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: House participates in Ivy City anniversary celebration.

Internal: The vigil celebrates the life and death of JWM.

Contradiction: Deciding corporately what is necessary to win on behalf of the continent and doing it in time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: A bravo was wished Ivy City colleagues by 300 people, government officials and community residents.

Internal: Two thousand eight hundred sheets of paper inkinded. Sites of December 1977 GWF are being investigated which include Connecticut general Insurance Company Community Facility, the Sheraton and Sonesta Hotels.

Contradiction: Trying to stay anchored as a House in the midst of TM '77 whirlwind. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: Four TM dates are set in four counties. Week of development initiation leads to over \$1000 committed.

Internal: Fantastic Dutch Tavern celebration launches debriefing weekend for New York theater.

Contradiction: Scheduling metro forces to aid campaigns. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: First real metro meeting since summer impacts colleagues with current total picture of the Movement and impacts House with the great number of years colleagues have been engaged in the Movement. Three TM circuiters report 21 dates set with firm yeses in 19 additional counties, signalling completion of coverage in New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Connecticut.

Internal: Circuiters celebrate Saturday night in Boston House's Paddy's Irish Tavern with Irish ale, witticisms, songs and revelry.

Contradiction: Building a detailed task plan to enable colleagues to engage in the task. (Wk. 1)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Combined teams from various task forces and House descend on Seaway for Week 11 circuits and impact local restaurant owner with corporate power; 25% of total communities visited in one day assure participation of all 10 counties in October Forum Days. French majorities push for bilingual Forums in Eastern Ontario as work continues in four counties for October 29 Forums.

Internal: Regional cross-pollination occurs as area colleagues play "Musical Houses." House is engaged on three fronts on Week 11 while Wayside Inn dynamic hosts two students from Brussels.

Contradiction: Maintaining the style and role of catalyzer to assure winning on all fronts at a time when each front cries for a blitz. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Regional colleague takes over leadership for Etobicoke Forum push.

Internal: Sends out Keller family. Jennifer Robins graduates to high school. More guests show up for House Church than House members, with all deciding to go to GRA and one to Lorne for summer.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum up for Etobicoke forums. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Iroquois High School teachers request consultation on the basis of their experience with a GCF a year ago, offering \$600 for self-support.

Internal: House goes to see "Papillon" movie and recalls great lines.

Contradiction: Contexting towns on GCF far enough in advance to let decision to have a longer period to percolate. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX--LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community Youth Forum is held with orchestration by Marsha Hahn, David Yost and Mary Boivin; 25 Lorne youth attend. Foundations for fire hall are poured. New Day New Brunswick teams double number of Forum secured to 30 by offering evening Forum format to small settlements. Saw mill: wheel loader arrives and a good used dump truck for slabwood is found in Saint John during a

Community Forum circuit.

Internal: Area Montreal Thanksgiving feast is held in Montreal House with 53 in attendance. Saturday celebration is highlighted by entertainment from Community Youth.

Contradiction: Securing land and getting facilities to house key economic programmes before heavy frost and snow make outside work impossible. (Wk. 4)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS--CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Cano Negro makes it to press as exemplary organized Community Development Project selected for one day visit (Sept. 25) by international labor and church leaders' conference. Venezuelan Minister of Environment and Renewable Resources writes extensive general letter of recommendation on basis of Cano Negro HDP. Community makes strides in leadership roles as principal health caretaker takes charge of dispensary area clean-up work day, manager of newly established general store places her first replenishment order with supplier, and another young community leader entirely directs leaders' planning session.

Internal: Newly arrived auxiliary staff JoAnn Gammel, Kenyon Wilson and John Reese are assigned to their guilds while entire staff enjoys refreshing end-of-quarter discontinuity in Caracas.

Contradiction: Establishing the symbolic foundations to sustain practical leadership training and community engagement. (Wk. 2)

Complete global meeting with Brussels and Singapore on layout of regular reporting system happens. Chicago Inkinds 1,500 Good Humor ice creams a week on an ongoing basis. Stipends begin to flow from Bombay Nexus. The global/local systems are at a point where they can absorb aberrations and still function smoothly. The unreconciled abstraction rather than concrete forms and structures of doing Global Management is the contradiction of the week.
