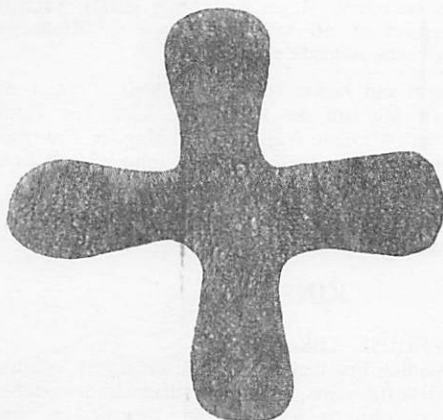

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Cahir Street meeting plans children's party, inking soft drinks and beginning clean-up of boat. Paints new mural on wall in Cahir Street estate. Construction of new steel warehouse on Isle of Dogs is encouraging sign of economic renewal in docklands.

Internal: Stream of visitors and sojourners includes two of the translators at Termine Consult, Mabel Morton from Chicago and Dr. Balchin, moderator of United Reformed Church. Sends Fiona Willock to Kreuzberg Ost to assist in training youth volunteers. Sends out Huang Hsing Peng to Lusaka ITI. Michael Shaw develops funds to go to India. Johnsons return from GRA and Global Priors Council.

Contradiction: Discovering new ways to spark interest and engagement in the community. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Year of the UK springs into action as area council with inkind songbooks hammers out next six weeks of maneuvers. The launch is signaled with 500 pre-registered for Whitfield TM with all money raised.

Internal: Year of the UK is embodied in reordering space, decor and internal life. Emersons visit and David Patterson sojourns.

Contradiction: Clarifying the channels that allow the Whitfield TM to play its key role in Scotland's mass TM strategy. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Intensive, sober tactical maneuver is planned for Wales IDO, valuable trek to island of Anglesea, focusing on Lianfairwillygwnyllgogerychwyndrobwlllantisiliogogosh.

Internal: Arrangements are made for moving to a new House. Adrienne Shaw begins sojourn.

Contradiction: Withstanding the colossal logistics necessary to implement the possibility of Wales 100. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Six travel with House to area council at Isle of Dogs. Three young adults return from three-week work/methods program at Kreuzberg Ost HDP.

Internal: Smith family arrives and occasions rearrangement of House space and orientation to all the region. Mary Murphy and three children are sent out from House Church to intern at Isle of Dogs HDP.

Contradiction: Getting quickly and effectively to market with applearc turned over by August resettlement and run over by year of Britain shifts. (Wk. 10)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: New contacts made by Indian sojourner, Bernard Paul, reveal openness toward the possibility of volunteers working for the ICA.

Internal: First guest dinner in new house christens the facility as "open to the public."

Contradiction: Generating new images of development. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: Community moves from stake visiting to stake meetings. Preschool has green inkind T shirts with grid and "I love you, Termine" printed on the front. August 15th national holiday is celebrated at fountain with steaks and sale of watermelon and drinks.

Internal: Peggy Schwalm is sent out to Greece. Chiara and Giuseppe de Luca are received from Rome and translate many songs and rituals into Italian.

Contradiction: Creating training model. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: House inkind 198 lbs. of rice, 82 reams of paper, \$65 of office supplies for CTI (Community Training

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

Institute). Sons of Ijede raise \$25,000 for development project in major fund raising event, where three Commissioners of Lagos State Ministries make supportive comments about ICA's work in the town. Inkinded street lamps (Philips) capture people's imagination. Ijede works with Brussels Development and makes promising calls on major funding agencies in London and Amsterdam. Community Farm sells last of maize.

Internal: Ijede welcomes Kitneys back form GRA and Global Priors Council. Vespa suffers multiple fractures, sliding under truck in 5 car smash and proving Hubert Fulkerson really does have a guardian angel.

Contradiction: Making the CTI the program it needs to be.(Wk. 9)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Development hosts Kilgore, Kameme and Patterson for week of pushing down the line USD 4000, letter of credit and USD 2,000 cash as hopefully last step to release Bayad trucks.

Internal: Hosts comings and goings of the Order to new assignments.

Contradiction: Devising method for the Year of the United Kingdom to intensify the three campaigns across Europe. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Wedding in Luxembourg is occasion for establishing advantageous informal relationship with key Luxembourg family.

Inerternal: Is impacted with enthusiasm about Bayad conveyed through Father Matteus, who passes through after World's Fair and GKA Chicago.

Contradiction: Finding creative ways to use minimal troops and vacation pace to intensify colleague contacts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: More money keeps flowing into ICA account as a result of development letter. Maneuvers are updated in terms of timing. Guardian and leading fish expert for developing nations says yes to being ICA adviser and yes to going on major foundation visits.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic expands house to ten members. Among guests are Kameme and Kilgore of Kawangware and Schwoebel of Bayad. Week II planning gets internal life ordered.

Contradiction: Getting the Amsterdam House in one place at the same time to make decisions on comprehensive maneuvering. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Calling on GWF prospects breaks loose names of influential women as well as names of organizational leadership. Alt-Heidelberg Core sets date for Forum: November 16.

Internal: Tribal resettlement happens in time for the arrival of Inger Bartram from Berlin.

Contradiction: Enabling GRA/Global Priors Council results to be the working context for full steam ahead in September.(Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Street lights on Falckenstrasse are painted blue. Kreuzberg Ost residents tell Berlin about KHDP on Berlin evening radio show. New supply of Kreuzberg Ost T shirts is sold out in one day. Ads for service directory hit 14000M. Vocational Training School offers to locate in Kreuzberg Ost. Global Language School has closing celebration; all students to continue in more advanced course. Newspaper prepared and printed in record time. Cafe receives ok from all four city offices in one day and is licensed. The grand opening is held on Saturday with live music, German and Turkish cakes and ceremony is held with Mayor and other guests. Saturday night celebration of 50 sees video tape of Kinderfest, Hinterhof barbecue and cafe opening.

Internal: David and Jackie Speicher are sent out to San Jose. Susan McClain to Rochester. CLC has closing celebration with Mexican feast. Richard Maguire arrives and begins new job next day. Clare, Julie and John Michael arrive. Rev Park Si Wong visits as cafe opens.

Contradiction: Intensifying momentum while changing personnel. (Wk. 10)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Opening Feast of Human Development Assembly welcomes 50 participants, including village leaders, school headmasters, church leaders, and Kawangware stake residents. District Officer, Mr. Miringi, gives opening talk on the deep roots of "Harambee"(pull together) which has imaginably educated all Kenyans in the power of corporateness. George Wambugu's stirring Maliwada report convinces all doubters that Kawangware HDP is the most important thing happening in Kenya.

Internal: Everyone "moves over" to make room for participants and Nairobi Area House staff at Kawangware while children move into old Area House facility for the two-week program. Landlord provides case of beer for staff's send-out of the Jim Campbell family to new assignment in Brazil. Celebrates wedding of Marcella Buchanan and Terry Jones with pre-wedding celebration breakfast reflecting on power of living in covenant and then attending wedding celebrated by ITI grad and colleague, Fr. Luke Mukolo.

Contradiction: Using the Human Development Assembly as a powerful launch pad for accelerating KHDP and TMs while attending to the necessary internal reorganization of consolidating two ICA centers into one. (Wk. 9)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Preschool teachers turn old house into new preschool in one week. Stakes ask for tools so they can work on the water facilities and raise to 60 to keep paid employees working. Sends out 19 visiting students to community vegetable garden to dig stumps. The first load of bricks are fired and delcared best in Egypt by man who should know. UN, Catholic Relief, and Ministry of Agriculture visit. Doctor examines babies who lost weight last month, and Abboni Metees returns from Kwangyung II and GRA:Chicago.

Internal: Sends Mark Poole and Iris Boivin to Chicago to make those all-important decisions.

Contradiction: Enabling everyone to keep up with increased momentum. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Recruitment trip to Central Province brings in first paid registration from Village Meetings, 21st registration

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP)
counting Kawangware, for Human Development Assembly. Assigns day-house troops to KHDP to prepare for August assembly.

Internal: Collegium on August children's curriculum excites House youth. Fanon continues to push context on revolutionary action.

Contradiction: Moving from general plans and context for August HDP to specific practices of preparation, believing that "Action will remove the doubt. . ." (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP
External: High tea for 100 people is inkinded at the Taj Mahal Hotel with the Replication School and Mrs. Vasant Rao Patil as chief guest. Proposal documents for the 24 projects are completed. Free spectacles for 250 villages are secured.

Internal: The birth of David Alexander (8lb 3oz) to John and Thea Patterson and the 30th birthday of Mario Yufomao are celebrated with singing and a feast.

Contradiction: Gearing total mobility into village replication back-up support system. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Three day project directors meeting begins on Saturday, August 14, at the International YMCA.

Internal: House experiences the possibility of accommodating 70 people who have come for the Project Directors' Meeting. Thomases are received as priors of Bombay Area.

Contradiction: Participating in House structures in the midst of numerous things needed to be done for the project directors meeting. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR -KENDUR HDP

External: Preschool is impacted this week with the artform of dance and the whole auxiliary is participating in English and Marathi classes, begun this week.

Internal: Work begins on a toilet for the auxiliary and the highlight of the week is a celebration Friday evening where Claire Clements danced.

Contradiction: Building the structures under work which allow for maximum participation of villagers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: Vaviharsh makes it on the postal map as Vaviharsh Post Office is opened with Vishnu Kekare, HDTS graduate, selected as Post Master. Three auxiliary members are sent to Male Village to initiate the project with the Consults. The village hand pump is finally repaired, bringing relief to village women, who carry water one furlong up the steep hills of the village.

Internal: A roll of blue cloth is inkinded and the auxiliary will now have their blue uniforms.

Contradiction: Orienting programs and tasks when the village's only concern is bringing off the next harvest. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Signboard arrives and is put up at village entrance. Makes key contacts with Lions and Rotary Clubs.

Internal: Auxiliary is all fitted with new blue clothes. Hosts several national and international visitors.

Contradiction: Focusing engagement into one corporate thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers, for the Demonstration Farm, Sanction of Parent Seed. Health Fair in village is great; Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city, attend. Clinic moves to new premises, larger with more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to the Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Presents proposal for piped water scheme to government authorities. Inaugurates village square. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village; sends two women to Malle Consult.

Internal: Sends Rose to Uit for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. Welcomes Ragunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad, new auxiliary.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: Receives one quintel of hybrid jowar and cotton for the demonstration farm on June 30, 1977. The Agriculture University sends fertilizer, insecticide, and seeds. The next day one of the university comes and gives guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary help in sowing seeds. Each house gets number, plus the community kitchen garden starts.

Internal: Shifts from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gives nice room for the project office in which the Uti HDP office is set up. This week many guests visit, one being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

Contradiction: Facing auxiliary and house problems. (Wk. 3)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Roger Butcher and Vivian Paul return from project directors meeting in Bombay with exciting reports from GRA. Global Council and replication plans for Maharashtra.

Internal: Miss Suzie George from Gwalior is received as intern. New decor from Summer '77 transforms House.

Contradiction: Structuring time to do the mission in the midst of few troops and many Emerging Generation. (Wk. 10)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Great Independence Day celebration (Aug. 15th) held-- first in Nadlapur with the whole village participating.

Internal: New project director, Mali Balm, welcomed for a quick stop en route to Project Directors Meeting.

Contradiction: Establishing in action the common task of the auxiliary and the village. (Wk. 9)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Internal: Corporate sessions are enlivened by report on Nadlapur Consult and the charting of the Tao. Has one job possibility in sight. J.P. Singh family, regional colleagues, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Opening the eyes of colleagues to the excitement of the MHDP and the replication and then flipping it for catalyzing interest in initiating a village project in Area Calcutta. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Hays travels to Kuala Lumpur for Sungai Sup government authorization visits and appointments with Shell and Malaysian Airlines for funding. Singapore development calls net \$300 (S) from Radio Holland, invitations for proposals to be submitted, and promise of donor contact list for Sungai Sup HDP.

Internal: Minister of Parliament, East Malaysia, writes letter authorizing Erica Hays to attend school in project site after year long holiday in Singapore. Teresa Lingenfelter stays overnight in Singapore on way to Priors Council. Yosts arrive from Kelapa Dua on visa/discontinuity visit. House impacted by GRA opening transcript.

Contradiction: Enabling HDP consult prep in midst of troop dispersal. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: New push is on Stake organization with daily walks and the creation of detailed maps and the team structure. One family offers two plots of land for community buildings. Daily Guild meetings "on the job" begin and children drop by community kitchen on way to kindergarden to see what the women are cooking up for snacks.

Internal: New spirit is released as we begin to get our minds around the naming of the enemy, design the maneuvers to attain victories, and struggle with grounding profound humanness. Michael takes the week off to have his appendix out.

Contradiction: Fully implementing plans during a low energy time and month of religious exercises. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: ICA gives HDP presentation to Siburo Rotary Club at the invitation of Dr. Lau. HDP brochure is completed and mailed while Sungai Aup community makes plans for the consultation, including Iban celebration for the opening celebration.

Internal: Staff completes vegetable garden and new toilet. Whole staff is impacted by GRA reports.

Contradiction: Waiting for all the pieces of the puzzle, while moving full force preparing minimal trained staff. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Kelapa Dua HDP celebrates one year anniversary with week of contests, concluded by ceremony and prizes awarded by Colonel Nasutlan. Over 300 people from all six stakes attend August 17th National Day parade. The parade which is the first one ever held in the area, included men, women, and children and was planned for and worked on by village leaders. One million rupiah (US \$2,500) gift received from CALTEX. We are one step closer to registration with the finalizing of the terms of reference with the Social Department.

Internal: Lushes are welcomed home from Global Prior's Council with great excitement. Adrie Nortier Mudji and Connie Widyatmaz return from discontinuity. Emerging Generation gets new dining and living room as part of total resettlement plan. Midsourse evaluation weekend with Kay's report regarding maneuvers and Tim's context about global assignments creates fear and fascination mood.

Contradiction: Making the transition from day-to-day task force operation to maneuver-oriented planning without losing the crucial things through the cracks. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Goes over top for yearly development goal of \$156,000. Money comes in for LENS and development to start the year year right. Tokyo trek for development continues.

Internal: Sends out Rafos to Chicago GRA, Michael Shaw to London, Grows to Korea. Frank Soderlind arrives from Manila.

Contradiction: Dealing creatively with a general antsiness in midst of limbo prior to new assignments across the zone. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Three elders and two village youth assisted by auxiliary muscle power erect entrance sign to Nam Wai. Sunday Funfair attracts family participation, including cooks for tea house and operators for game stalls. Town Banners give unofficial but affirmative response to land use plan.

Internal: John, Melinda and Heather Howell are sent out to new assignment in Manila. Frank Soderlind and Larry, Rhonda and Teran Loepke arrive in Nam Wai a few hours later to take up their new assignments!

Contradiction: Keeping momentum going while waiting for Government approval for major visible signs. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Marine Lab brings blueprints for Demonstration Pond, following visit by villager. Preschool loses two teachers (back to H.S.) and gains three. Development toes on trips to Kaosiung and Taipei and holds two teacher training sessions. Guild discusses Haiang proposal to support preschool.

Internal: On Monday, all Chinese staff leave village (temporarily), but on Tuesday two more come to help with translation and on Friday another joins; Katherine Cheng, Dwight Wang, and Rosemary Ding are great help. Ecclesiola goes to Kaohsiung to see "A Bridge Too Far" for quarter celebration.

Contradiction: Getting funding for dramatic visible signs to accelerate the HDP. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Sudtonggan HDP annual report is printed.

Internal: Blackledge sent out; Howells and Vergaras arrived; Altons and Robertsons hosted on way; Batika development received \$100.

Contradiction: Daring to move on development and self support prior to getting clarity on region's missional thrust for this year. (wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Over 30 people gather for Regional Council and celebration. Plans for the coming year reveal busy training course calendar, beginning with a CSIIIA October 1st.

Internal: In the midst of first week back to school, the Hilliards visit Taipei House, and Dwight Wang is sent out for his military service.

Contradiction: Getting into a practical model for a daily work schedule as the vision of the year begins to appear. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Ben Potot returns from Worlds Fair, GRA and Council bringing life to the whole village. The Navy paints the early learning center and the community celebrates with the adult education class and the induction produces three times more than the local corn as financial reporting at the manager's meeting proves that the four new industries can pay off their loans and still show a profit for the year.

Internal: Dick Alton arrives with new songbooks and GRA material and reports on the 16 global priorities. Helen Newkirk and her mother visit.

Contradiction: Allowing programs to slip after being implemented. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Circuit to Mati for initial workshop leaders training session includes impromptu speaking engagement with the Rotary Club, and 50 present at the first training session when only 30 were expected!

Internal: Four people from Nabunturan decide to sojourn for three months and raise the necessary money from the community. House workday prepares for new staff arrivals with tribal resettlement. New curtains are sewn, and all House linen laundered.

Contradiction: Deciding to move ahead boldly despite communication gaps about area plans for Council travel. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The holding of the Sanya Summer Festival for 300 people by the guild marks the first such festival in ten years. Both Japanese and English documents are published and distributed.

Internal: House prior returns from Chun Cheon ITI.

Contradiction: Obtaining visa letters for new staff. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Villagers really have "taken charge" this week as they send out their two top leaders to Chicago to prepare for replication without even losing a beat in village activities. Youth leaders arrange to take over 100 children on each of two summer youth program trips. Guild Three trains two people from each ban in the use of inkinded mowers in an all-day training and practice session. The agricultural and health guilds join forces to immunize more than 1100 chickens in one night.

Internal: Quiet has turned to a multiplicity of sounds as the ITI participants, the rest of the children, and the Salmons arrive, complete with inkinded mattresses and blankets and the long-awaited box of goodies from the Chicago Global Research Assembly.

Contradiction: Staying ahead of villagers in vision and planning to keep up the momentum. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Churcheon ITI closes with great celebration for the 70 participants from nine countries; visits head of PeaceCorps in Seoul to work out relationship with Kwangyung Il.

Internal: Hosts many participants and faculty after ITI.

Contradiction: Funding multiple, simultaneous programs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Quarter battleplanning reveals possibilities where none were before. Internal: Momie Nakamura is sent out to Houston via Tokyo; Mrs. James (Ann Ziegenmiers mother) to St. Louis and Mrs Moore to a new job. The Jenkins family is received.

Contradiction: Creating corporate time where the story is that there is no time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: One thousand five hundred Oyubari documents are completed in Japanese; 1222 are sent to Oyubari by inkinded air freight. Incorporation financial support signatures begin coming in. Yeses to regional council invitations assure community, guardian and business input into TM, GWF and Guardian taskforces. Regional colleagues welcome the Blackledges with community restaurant dinner.

Internal: Orientation weekend involves whole House in fresh look at Japanese language and environment. Discontinuity exposes House members to new area of region. Weekend PSU prepares house for settling in with new space and time design and assignments.

Contradiction: Maximizing English teaching benefits while minimizing teaching load. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: The Oyubari Young Mens' Group initiates the first annual logging festival on August 21 in grand style with inkind hatchets for prizes. Horsehoe throwing and trampoline bouncing happen all day long to the joy of the 200 participants. The evening is topped off with 1,000 participants. The people watch the famous "Nebuta" lanterns brought to Oyubari for the first time ever by the Oyubari Jaycees. Sixty-two students and staff of Rikkyo University arrive and immediately clear the ski slope and create a town plaza with the aid of an inkind bulldozer.

Internal: Guardian Dennis Burkhart is sent out to Pennsylvania. The House takes a new relationship to space as the decor goes up three weeks before area council and the new table cloths arrive just in time for ecclesiola and the writing of project 60-day report.

Contradiction: Seeing the line tape on the tennis court as snow begins to fall. (Wk. 10)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: In the midst of the preparation for wedding and area council troops are sent to the first area maneuver in Adelaide. Research is continued for two new Aboriginal sites and United Nations Association of Australia conference is attended.

Internal: Intensive inkind blitz for area council is made as people come and go en route to global assignments, maneuvers, and Development PSU.

Contradiction: Putting form on the area council event so that the next year is launched with corporate intentionality and power. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Dinner guests from Diamong Poultry Industry give report on visit to Oombulgurri and promise further assistance. Leadership of ANZAAS (Australian and New Zealand Association for the Advancement of Science) in

preparation for Perth's 150th anniversary results in authorization, summer program and development prospects.

Internal: Oliveann Slotta begins new job with French school board as area troops and supplies are mobilized in six cars for trek to New Brunswick Area Council II.

Contradiction: Maintaining an effective pace for the long march into the "Crimson Forest". (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Regional colleague takes over leadership for Etobicoke Forum push.

Internal: Sends out Keller family. Jennifer Robins graduates to high school. More guests show up for House Church than House members, with all deciding to go to GRA and one to Lorne for summer.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum up for Etobicoke forums. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Greenville Community Development days are held. Sixteen communities commit themselves with St. Lawrence saying that they will find \$1200 per GCF for as many as we get.

Internal: House participates in Lorne Day and the concluding council, a two-week area-wide maneuver to launch the year.

Contradiction: Creating images to mobilize all staff toward areal rather than local maneuvers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Magnificent Seven Maneuver sets 17 CFC dates. Sawmill gets first order for \$2000 worth of lumber from outside community Fure Hall land is acquired. Pre- school registers 35 children. Credit union, handicrafts and LEDC get located in mobile. Lorne is covered with signs of stakes, programs and welcome.

Internal: Beet greens are eaten all week from beet harvest. Many colleagues are hosted as they spend vacation time working on preschool and agricultural preparation in Lorne.

Contradiction: Using day to day events as leadership training structures which give responsibility for the project to the community. (Wk. 9)

CARACAS

Contradiction: Designing internal structures that will enable and proper impetus in external mission. (Wk. 9)

Key to the maneuver is the possibility of laymen and youth actually engaging in a village. The hunger for concrete engagement is intense. Circuiters report that the local church is on the verge of breaking loose into a new intensity of missional engagement. The contradiction lies in pushing the amoebic principle of the circuits to the last corners of North America, thus demanding total creativity in making a \$9000 week (or a \$36,000 month) from circuits.

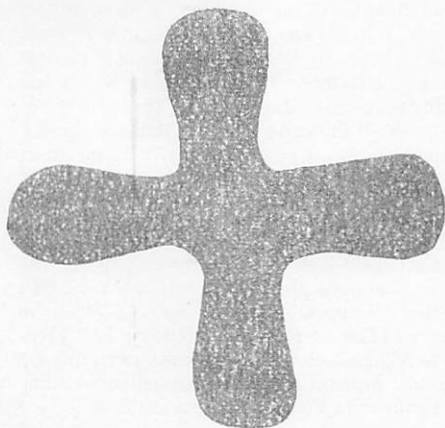

External: Visit with Fiat and EEC starts Development ball rolling.

Internal: Whole House travels 26 hours to fantastic continental council in Brussels. Emerging Generation stays with Termine neighbors to participate in annual festa of St. Vincenzo.

Contradiction: Spreading the troops like jam and the money like butter on a whole loaf of Italian bread and having it taste like anything. (Wk. 13)

Internal: Area priors meeting in Singapore demonstrates a new kind of globality and corporateness and symbolizes area expansion by setting dates for three HDP Consults and launching three new Houses.

Contradiction: Finding effective ways of village participation in midst of preparation for Hare Raya. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project has visitors: two from Dutch organization, Stichting Benoevolentia, who are impressed with fact that ICA is here in Kelapa Dua. Santa Fe Pomeroy Company manages pledges to help build water system and budgets. Priors from six regions and Centrum participate in Area Council in Singapore and plan the implementation of five "Singapore Strongholds" in the arena of staff, funding, and consult preparation. Bi-weekly health meetings with cadre begin with Tolib, Lagrie, the village health workers, plus ICA staff.

Internal: Everybody returns from Singapore. Collegiums on the summer and Global Priors Council help focus the task. Paints the Emerging Generation room. New Health Outpost opens.

Contradiction: Continuing the race at top speed and laying the tracks at the same time. (Wk. 13)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: ICA sends Donnelly and Park Si Won to Tokyo Area Council Cebu Development blitz visits 170 companies in five days. Manila development trek opens possibility for new level of funding.

Internal: Three women continue to hold the fort. Park Si Won gives illuminating report on HDP trek and visits Nam Wai assisting in evaluation there. ICA hosts Australian Deputy Director of Ministry of Health who is impressed with work in Nam Wai.

Contradiction: Realizing that in the shooting gallery of life the targets keep shifting! (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Government official from the Agriculture and Fisheries Department give lecture on pig management to Nam Wai farmers. About 25 local people attend the four-hour session held in the project conference room. The main road through the village is repaired in one section which was nearly impassable; and all potholes along the entire roadway are filled in.

Internal: Four House members and Yau Hung Wa, a villager from Nam Wai, visit Sudtonggan for a few days after attending area council in Manila. House celebrates the return of all troops from area council with dinner at a local restaurant followed by an excursion to the Chui Cat Opera, a very elaborate performance done in an open-air theater.

Contradiction: Shifting individual enterprise to corporate community venture. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG -HAI OU HDP

External: Moves 6,180 bricks; holds preschool teacher training. The Chief of Social Affairs visits.

Internal: Some of the local auxiliary return with friends. The electricity is on and off; finishes HDP document.

Contradiction: Getting coordination between materials and transportation in order to build something. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Sudtonggan HDP annual report is printed.

Internal: Blackledge sent out; Howells and Vergaras arrived; Altons and Robertsons hosted on way; Batica development received \$100.

Contradiction: Daring to move on development and self support prior to getting clarity on region's missional thrust for this year. (wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Those Taiwan forces returning from the area council in Manila travel through Taipei and share the area report. Hai Ou gets a telephone installed free of charge.

Internal: Titus Yven returns from ITI all excited.

Contradiction: "Moving it" today when something inside wants a comprehensive model and all troops together. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: "Cebu 250" Development maneuver is in full swing with four teams out for eight days and villagers going on every visit. Development card file is set up in one miracle weekend using eight students from St. Teresas College (who hand draw 1,000 cards!) and begin similar card tracking system for each person in village-912 cards!

Internal: Twenty overnite guests from one to five nights in duration give immediate impetus to tribal resettlement and transfer industries inventory from House to newly completed community buildings.

Contradiction: Embodying in full the "Religious House" dynamic in midst of an established HDP. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Entire House journeys to Sudtonggan to complete Development file and assist in launching the Great Cebu 250 Maneuver.

Internal: House planning aboard "sweet grace" creates six winning maneuvers for Davao victory in Quarter II, including the "banana bonanza" and the "Mindanao Magical Mystery Tour" maneuvers.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly to set up the 15 GCFs in Davao City for Week Four. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Japanese language documents are delivered to key contacts in Tokyo. Operations dynamic swings into play as Centrum representative arrives to enable ticketing for area council.

Internal: Arrival of Ferguson family, Elizondo and Momie swells House ranks and gives all a look at broader contexts.

Contradiction: Opening new present directions in midst of unfocused mission. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Industrial procedures and budgets are finished and the Village Treasury assembly receives all instructions. Men women and bulldozer level ground for second chicken house. Health outpost celebrates its first month

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP)
in self-support. Peace Corps volunteers visit for evaluation.

Internal: ICA inkind blackboard for developing children's school. Collegium on Replication School pushes imaginations into the future.

Contradiction: Increasing replication momentum while waiting for directions from area council. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Area prior visits Jeju to report on Global Priors Council, see Kwangyung II and meet Governor Chang. Trip to Chun Cheon to visit colleagues and the village leader happens. US Peace Corps decides to send two volunteers to Kwangyung II HDP as an experiment.

Internal: House sends out colleagues to new assignments in Hai Ou and Sudtonggan and holds ecclesiola using "Estimates II: Those who Care." House picnic celebrates new sojourner and House member. Submits passport papers for three House ladies.

Contradiction: Trusting time which informs all to wait, while building practical weaponsry systems. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Quarter battleplanning reveals possibilities where none were before. Internal: Momie Nakamura is sent out to Houston via Tokyo; Mrs. James (Ann Ziegenmier mother) to St. Louis and Mrs Moore to a new job. The Jenkins family is received.

Contradiction: Creating corporate time where the story is that there is no time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Receives report that Nihongodo (Japanese translation) documents arrived in Oyubari at just the right time, deeply impacting families of community of Oyubari. Government officials set two dates for GWF in November.

Internal: Bank accounts are now in the name of ICA and Osaka House. Emerging Generation performs miracles in ordering chaos in Week II blitz while adults earn \$500 extra with intensive English classes.

Contradiction: Responding realistically to the demands of the day. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Work camp of 62 students and staff from Rikkyo (St. Paul's) University of Tokyo catalyzes major physical accomplishments. Japanese documents are distributed to every family in Oyubari. Oyubari Voice Number Four and 60-day report are printed. Sapporo church (Rev. Hirata, ITI grad) council gives vote of confidence to sponsoring new OHDP staff.

External: In the midst of the preparation for wedding and area council, troops are sent to the first area maneuver in Adelaide. Research is continued for two new Aboriginal sites and United Nations Association of Australia conference is attended.

Internal: Intensive inkind blitz for area council is made as people come and go en route to global assignments, maneuvers, and Development PSU.

Contradiction: Putting form on the area council event so that the next year is launched with corporate intentionality and power. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Dinner guests from Diamond Poultry Industry give report on visit to Oombulgurri and promise further assistance. Leadership of ANZAAS (Australian and New Zealand Association for the Advancement of Science) in preparation for Perth's 150th anniversary results in authorization, summer program and development prospects.

Internal: Linda Zahrt is hosted during week of health services conference. Neil Rees completes term with "best ever" promotion report form high school.

Contradiction: Keeping the mission moving when house is reduced to one for two weeks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: KITCO guild women visit warehouse and building suppliers in Darwin.

Internal: House finances finishes Order year in the black, hosts KITCO guild women for the week.

Contradiction: Gearing up for GSD extension and CMA when have known that is on all the time. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Follow-up to Community Meeting in Campbelltown results in decision to do five more, one in each neighborhood. Each region returns from area council with mandate to pioneer a particular assigned demonstration in the arena of GSD, GCF or GSF.

Internal: Entire house participates in area council in Sydney and attends Clover-Newkirk wedding. Area youth decide to build curriculum of Phase I Summer program.

Contradiction: Converting global consensus into local battleplan which will engage regional and House troops. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Area maneuver, Operation Rainbow Trail, engages 18 troops in five awakenment events and internalizes the profundity of Community Meeting Australia. House experiences turning around of images as to where, when and with whom mass awakenment events can happen.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE:BRISBANE
External: Boat is offered for Oombulgurri. CMA workshop training begins with seven participants.

Internal: Henry Lichtermuth from Perth gives big boost to workshop training. Pom Lichtermuth goes on development calls. Jennifer Ross is sent out to Melbourne, Carlos Betonte to colleagues for school holidays and Jim Newkirk to Adelaide and Sydney.

Contradiction: Releasing the energies of colleagues to care for the geography.(Wk 9)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP
External: Gridding and research focuses on stakes as the means to enable the selection of the site for the "Showplace of the Marshalls".

Internal: A new year is signified by new internal life structures being built during Week II with new teams and assignment rationales as well as a hard look at self-support.

Contradiction: Forging the authentic local consensus for the next year plan. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA
External: Metro cadre sends out Roberts family at celebration. Forty colleagues present are impacted by "two suitcase" and "blue shirt" images as ITI grad, Guardian and House prior speeches ground ICA presence in Western Samoa and other global locations.

Internal: Continues barracks and troop preparation.

Contradiction: Regrouping the troops and positioning forces on one front with full engagement on another front. (Wk. 11)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

Internal: Sends out two House members as consultants to Vogar and Botagama. House EG and Youth celebrates the end fo school.

Contradiction: Taking creative relationship to the ambiguous situation ahead. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO
External: Visits twenty plus communites with ten core meetings set up in Valley area. Bob Vance reports \$2500 worth of inkind for the next five weeks in motels and restaurants.

Internal: Has a spirited Friday night strategy and debriefing session with a large number of metro colleagues.

Internal: Job for \$16,300 is landed on first day, with first interview. House and visiting Development team celebrate with picnic at Griffith Park. House captures a mechanical goat to harvest the lawn.

Contradiction: Sorting and prioritizing the many do's so they all become doable. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX
External: The "Arizona eight " county circuit is started. Ten missional priorities are decided for the year. ICA has great visit with Four Corners Commision to open HDP funding across country.

Internal: Ruth Jefferies hosts House and colleagues for dinner and drinks to celebrate area priors visit. Phoenix takes over car and payments from San Jose House.

Contradiction: Finding the winning terrain for capturing the counties. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY
External: After two months of assemblies, councils and planning ICA hits the road full speed once again netting a new state TM brochure and poster with one Town Meeting scheduled and three more in the works.

Internal: Circuiters from Nevada on the road make a stop in to Saltine of shared reports, stories and reflections releases all to go out again, with renewed motivation and corporate wisdom.

Contradiction: Standing in the tension between total state coverage in one quarter with Town Meeting and the absence of means of quick community consensus forming in most towns. (Wk. 13)

Contradiction: Doing one task until it gets completed. (Wk. 13)

Contradiction: Holding the tensor, between beckoning troops and over-running them. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Authorization visits with key figures continue to strengthen the web of relationships between ICA and greater Vancouver. Circuiting in three regional districts yields two first meetings scheduled with four more moving. Anticipated circuiting by bus necessitates participation by local people in circuit enablement.

Internal: Sends Duncan and Rachel Holmes to Vogar HDP.

Contradiction: Building continuous leadership. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG-VOGAR HDP

External: First circuits are completed. Community development corporation request goes before rural municipality council.

Internal: Auxiliary moves again while last log goes up on House walls. Geese lie low at beginning of hunting season, but auxiliary member bags two anyway.

Contradiction: Creating the practical action which relates the overwhelming felt need of community to the basic contradictions and comprehensive plan. (Wk. 13)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Area council designs eight maneuvers spearheaded by "The Promised 250" (TMs) and "The Grand 35" (35 grand for self-support.)

Internal: "Grand 35" kicks off to create huge area self-support surplus by October first. House accomodates 27 guests for council, while the other 70 enjoy inkind rooms in six motels. Pat Bunce begins internship.

Contradiction: Mobilizing forces to make every minute a money-making minute during the three weeks of "Grand 35." (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Panhandle-Plains TM Assembly celebrates 16 new counties done with 10 more scheduled.

Internal: House meets for first time as new House staff as the Panhandle-Plains strike force disbands.

Contradiction: Blending maneuvers on self-support, Town Meeting and Development. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Letter from Bishop Flores recommends TM to all Dioceses. Internal: As House entered the Immaculate Conception Gate, Fr. Joseph Lapauw of St. Jude Church, waiting for arrival, greets all with "Welcome to San Antonio". Immaculate Conception Church welcomes the staff though the church bulletin. Pick up truck is on loan until December. One job starts this week. Area priors visit.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the economic support. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: The two remaining Oklahoma Panhandle counties held TMs last Saturday evening and Sunday afternoon. Both towns have a population of 500 and had over 10% of the citizens present for the TMs.

Internal: Shock and sound quiet is experienced with nine phase I beginning school and celebrated with picnic at Lake Lewisville. Phase I and Phase II struggle with grilling hamburgers on faulty grill. Everybody eats raw hamburger. Troy Jarvis adds Texas wisdom to battleplanning.

Contradiction: Deciding forces of engagement for all ages in the Dallas House and breaking loose circuiters from bimetro colleagues. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: As preschool nears completion (restoration of the old Post Office in business section) 35 people fill out applications for the nine salaried positions available through the Title XX grant. One auxiliary and five members of the Youth Service Corps spend weekend at Pine Bluff Pace slides at the invitation of the youth group.

Internal: Many visitors pass through; extended families, Order members on Discontinuity (Robert and Cheryl Truman), and guardians (Bob and Judy Donaldson from Nashville).

Contradiction: Creating forms for sustaining engagement. (Wk.9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Jimmy Fitzmorris, Lieutenant Governor of Louisiana, agrees to be honorary chairman of the Louisiana committee for TM.

Internal: Last one out locks the door, as all journey to Houston for area council, where region is represented in five House people and six metro people.

Contradiction: Keeping present TM plates spinning, while shooting down the corridor of raising \$3,500 for self-support toward the target of two full-time circuits. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Informal Evening at the Institute fascinates guests with GSD story and plans for Pace support and visits. Guardian network across region lights up with four committed for Guardians meeting. Local guardian commits himself to foot rent bill (\$350/month.)

Internal: Evelyn Kurihara arrives and inkinds supper. All our youth employed for one afternoon of stapling. Susan Antenen stops en route to Pace.

Contradiction: Earning "Grand 35" money for self-support blitz. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: South Dekalb County steering committee mails 1500 brochures to community leaders.

Internal: "Maneuver 35 Grand" intensifies as another second job is secured. A proposal for two circuiters salaries is submitted. Terry and Marcelja (Buchanan) Jones visit en route to Chicago.

Contradiction: Rushing the completion of "Grand 35 Maneuver" and the initiation of maneuvers so that success is insured in both. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Seventy-two tickets are donated by Hardees for Town Meeting circuiters.

Internal: Team structures are created for the quarter. Three are employed in temporary or part-time jobs.

Contradiction: Solidifying the frayed ends of the rope. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: House moves on to Miami to visit colleagues and to make plans for an Evening at the Institute.

Internal: Whole House(three) will be working the serving shift for next two weeks. Selling or giving away of stored House furnishings reduces storage bill 85%.

Contradiction: Moving fast enough to maintain trust in all the possibilities. (Wk. 13)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Prepares materials, both printing and collating for HDP sites around the globe. Readies the building for both the Academy and the Guardians consult. Creates curriculum, time-lines and makes initial preparations for the acceleration treks. Sends one person to Lorne for three days to teach a course and do basic acceleration.

Internal: Sends Kent Tomlinson to Oyubari, J. Ganne Gammel and John Reese to Cano Negro. Finishes work on the Internal Life Guide and the Solitary Journal.

Contradiction: Pushing through the maneuvers and wading right in. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Robbins, Illinois, holds TM. The Cooperative Extension Director gives a day to TM circuiting. ICA receives HUD gift of \$154,000. Fifth City starts repainting the mural. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Week of 15 evening meetings sets five Town Meeting dates and initiates seven host committees. Week II is spent in year's battleplan session with colleagues.

Internal: Renting of two rooms brings House halfway to goal of "free facility." Vickie lands temporary job.

Contradiction: Keeping all the plates spinning and starting up new ones. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

LeClaire Town Meeting (March 1977) wins the LeClaire Jaycees the Sweepstakes Award (best in state) for Governmental Affairs project among Iowa Jaycees.

Internal: Omaha House is visited for House Church. House celebrates birth of Christopher Brian to Dick and Peggy Mark on September 16. House earns \$375 for doing a one-day seminar for Area Council on Aging, set up by Kansas City House with possibility of doing 12 more in the state; great possibilities for House sustenance money.

Contradiction: Getting years' plan into enough of a focus to spin the motivating story to engage Town Meeting colleagues in the specifics of doing Town Meeting and GSD site selection maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Weekend circuit to Michigan's upper peninsula and Week I circuit to Wisconsin's peninsula results in two TMs set and seven working.

Internal: Barb Bellamy gets raise and increase in hours at job, while metro colleague takes responsibility for Week I Day II child care.

Contradiction: Jumping to hyper-speed in TM set up, not just doing last years model faster, and supplying the fuel that jump will need. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

Contradiction: Initiating a system of continuous follow through that is based on the comprehensive contradiction in the New York metro. Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Familiarization trek into Region of Future Action (West Virginia) at colleague's home for splendid picnic and enlightening is relative to Human Development Project feasibility and Town Meeting application. Internal: Inking for area council produce manna for the multitude (including a fifth of vodka) with several baskets leftover!

Contradiction: Gearing up to do the mission before the orders have been cut. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: "Vast Acquisition Maneuver" has begun in the Northern Division, the New York Theatre, with 52 towns visited and 21 yeses this past week. Decisions emerge from the tri-metro forces to circuit.

Contradiction: Plugging into all arenas while being totally engaged in Town Meeting. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

Contradiction: Creating corporate visible signs. (Wk. 11)

Global Development Centrum reports that the Saturday reporting and reflection sessions at Chicago Nexus focussed on the first full week of nine circuits working out of the 1977-78 maneuvers. The key breakthrough in all circuits was the Maharashtra Village Adoption Maneuver. Twelve churches are seriously considering the \$9600 over three years to cover extra-national funding. Key to the maneuver is the possibility of laymen and youth actually engaging in a village. The hunger for concrete engagement is intense. Circuiters report that the local church is on the verge of breaking loose into a new intensity of missional engagement. The contradiction lies in pushing the amoebic principle of the circuits to the last corners of North America, thus demanding total creativity in making a \$9000 week (or a \$36,000 month) from circuits.

Global Research Centrum reports from Australia a new level of Federal authorization for HDP expansion. From Chicago, the completion of Quarter II Ecclesiola manual. Community Youth Forum has a brochure printed and 14 Forums scheduled in North America for Quarter II. The Academy begins final countdown and space preparation for projected 50 participants. Arenas of brooding promising breakloose include the historic church relations, the ITI strategy, the Centrum of dynamics, the Barefoot Jesus, maneuver dynamics and GSD campaign documentation. Morning and evening Centrum collegiums weld a corporate force out of unique and varied passions establishing once more the vital importance of corporate brooding on a prepared model.

Global Operations Centrum reports Area Hong Kong's GCF maneuvers are ready for the year, including long and short sword maneuvers to enable 66 for the Philippines, 16 for Hong Kong and six for Taiwan. Singapore Centrum a breakthrough in visas and ticketing happened so that at the Area Sydney Council all newly assigned staff was present. 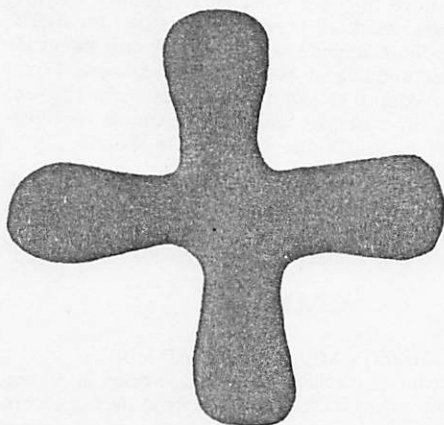

External: Phoning for regional planning week-end brings a yes from every call. Don Elliot arranges similar event a week later in Newcastle.

External: Wedding in Luxembourg is occasion for establishing advantageous informal relationship with key Luxembourg family.

Internal: Is impacted with enthusiasm about Bayad conveyed through Father Matteus, who passes through after World's Fair and GRA Chicago.

Contradiction: Finding creative ways to use minimal troops and vacation pace to intensify colleague contacts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House participates in Continental GWF pedagogy.

Internal: Grand continental council reveals an unprecedented corporateness across the continent and reinforces conviction that present advantages and strategies call for pioneering with TM in urban communities. Welcomes Martha Dempster.

Contradiction: Broadening the constituency of active steering committees. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: ICA receives 12,500 meeting. Training begins for German language school teachers with both Turkish and Germans on staff. Two new women volunteer to coordinate childrens' afterschool program. Saturday celebration is held in Kreuzberg Ost Centrum to celebrate the Lubner Strasse street festival. Pot-luck dinner, old Berlin decor, accordion music and dancing highlight the evening. Presentation of Kreuzberg Ost HDP is made to group concerned with "human dwelling places" in Frankfurt.

Internal: Lothar Schmidt visits and invites staff to do consultation with teaching staff of Augustinian monks. Two are sent to Frankfurt for special presentation and one to Brussels for GWF pedagogy.

Contradiction: Building the obvious and hidden forms which sustain the decision. (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Opening Feast of Human Development Assembly welcomes 50 participants, including village leaders, school headmasters, church leaders, and Kawangware stake residents. District Officer, Mr. Miingi, gives opening talk on the deep roots of "Harambee" (pull together) which has imaginably educated all Kenyans in the power of corporateness. George Wambugu's stirring Maliwada report convinces all doubters that Kawangware HDP is the most important thing happening in Kenya.

Internal: Everyone "moves over" to make room for participants and Nairobi Area House staff at Kawangware while children move into old Area House facility for the two-week program. Landlord provides case of beer for staff's send-out of the Jim Campbell family to new assignment in Brazil. Celebrates wedding of Marcella Buchanan and Terry Jones with pre-wedding celebration breakfast reflecting on power of living in covenant and then attending wedding celebrated by ITI grad and colleague, Fr. Luke Mukolo.

Contradiction: Using the Human Development Assembly as a powerful launch pad for accelerating KHDO and TMs while attending to the necessary internal reorganization of consolidating two ICA centers into one. (Wk. 9)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Preschool teachers turn old house into new preschool in one week; stakes ask for tools so they can work on the water facilities and raise to 60 to keep paid employees working. UN, Catholic Relief, and Ministry of Agriculture visit, doctor examines babies who lost weight last month, and Abboni Meteas returns from Kwangyung II and GRA:Chicago.

Internal: Sends Mark Poole and Iris Boivin to Chicago to make those all important decisions.

Contradiction: Enabling everyone to keep up with increased momentum. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Development maneuvers pay off as Kenya Charity Sweepstakes asks for permission to make properly publicized presentation of money and Catholic Secretariat asks us to increase our proposal from Kenya 21,000 shillings to 60,000. Internal: Collegium on the profundity of TM, writing contradiction statements, and fireside stories signal the intensity of working on an October campaign.

Contradiction: Carrying through and delivering Town Meeting victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Prairie Forum Day Maneuver is initiated as the House covers over 1000 miles and visits 15 communities.

Internal: Inkind contacts net \$85 retail value of food while metro colleague initiates House hunting for free facility.

Contradiction: Forging one thrust for the quarter with temporary troops and late arrivals not yet here. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG--VOGAR HDP

External: First circuits are completed. Community development corporation request goes before rural municipality eouncil.

Internal: Auxiliary moves again while last log goes up on House walls. Geese lie low at beginning of hunting season, but auxiliary member bags two anyway.

Contradiction: Creating the practical action which relates the overwhelming felt need of community to the basic contradictions and comprehensive plan. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Prior visits Roman Catholic Bishop in Corpus Christi for TM sponsorship and project authorization. House takes "research plunge" in library gathering data on 31 counties and 310 cities.

Internal: Grand 35 raises \$10,984 raised three weeks in thru budget cuts, extra employment, tax rebates, family gifts etc.

Contradiction: Turning two house circuiters into two teams. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Panhandle-Plains TM Assembly celebrates 16 new counties done with 10 more scheduled.

Internal: House meets for first time as new House staff as the Panhandle-Plains strike force disbands.

Contradiction: Blending maneuvers on self-support, Town Meeting and development. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Letter from Bishop Flores recommends TM to all Dioceses. Internal: As House entered the Immaculate Conception Gate, Fr. Joseph Lapauw of St. Jude Church, waiting for arrival, greets all with "Welcome to San Antonio". Immaculate Concepcion Church welcomes the staff though the church bulletin. Pick up truck is on loan until December. One job starts this week. Area priors visit.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the economic support. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House mobilizes all troops to raise \$3500 by end of month with four adults working as cashiers/waitresses evenings and youth washing dishes after school and weekends.

Internal: Guestrooms are painted and cleared by youth while wedding plans are in full motion.

Contradiction: Creating the imaginal story that keeps all activity as one thrust. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Court judge of Henderson County endorses Town Meeting: Texas with letter to Dallas House. Printed report of East Texas 25 has been completed and will be available to take to area council. A battle-planning weekend prepares House for the year in the bimetro.

Internal: Shock and sound quiet is experienced with nine phase I beginning school and celebrated with picnic at Lake Lewisville. Phase I and Phase II struggle with grilling hamburgers on faulty grill. Everybody eats raw hamburger. Troy Jarvis adds Texas wisdom to battleplanning.

Contradiction: Deciding forces of engagement for all ages in the Dallas House and breaking loose circuiters from bimetro colleagues. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Jackson trip guarantees Title XX funding for Day Care Center and gets ICA registered in Mississippi for VISTA application. Existing land use map is completed and 40 architecture students from Mississippi State University visit Pace to take pictures, and gather data from residents for housing designs, central plaza design and scale models.

Internal: Implemented Grand 35 tactics include Development letter to 175 on mailing list, yard sale and carnival - a great success and happening which produces \$264.

Contradiction: Structurally enabling the individual resolve to bracket anxieties and trust the corporate week's battleplan. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Jimmy Fitzmorris, Lieutenant Governor of Louisiana, agrees to be honorary chairman of the Louisiana committee for TM.

Internal: Last one out locks the door, as all journey to Houston for area council, where region is represented in five House people and six metro people.

Contradiction: Keeping present TM plates spinning, while shooting down the corridor of raising \$3,500 for self-support toward the target of two full-time circuits. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Second visit with local businessman who has relatives in Pace brings \$100 in self-support cash and part-time job. Garage sale brings \$250, a clean garage and a great introduction to neighbors.

Internal: The Ronin readings at evening meals set the stage for discipline of work projects and thriftiness.

Contradiction: Ready for W. Tennessee and N. Mississippi one week hence while pouring all forces into raising self-support. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: South Dekalb County steering committee mails 1500 brochures to community leaders.

Internal: Maneuver "35 Grand" intensifies as another second job is secured. A proposal for two circuitors salaries is submitted. Terry and Marcella (Buchanan) Jones visit en route to Chicago.

Contradiction: Rushing the completion of "Grand 35" maneuver and the initiation of maneuvers so that success is insured in both. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Positive initial visits with officials in two counties for school and community TM. Follow-up phone blitz in Shelby yields \$35 in two hours. Cannon Mills agrees to support TMs as it comes from the local. Five people plan to go to Guardians Meeting. Metro colleague meeting brings about a commitment from all for regular participation through coming quarter.

Internal: House meets to create family budgets and youth cluster fund.

Contradiction: Creating the necessary symbolic products that prepare all for shifting from Grand 35 Maneuver to Mighty Majestic Maneuver. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: House moves on to Miami to visit colleagues and to make plans for an evening at the Institute.

Internal: Whole House(three) will be working the serving shift for next two weeks. Selling or giving away of stored House furnishings reduces storage bill 85%.

Contradiction: Moving fast enough to maintain trust in all the possibilities. (Wk. 13)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-NEXUS

External: Cross-Centrum task forces pull together to prepare for upcoming Guardians Consult and to reconstruct Guild Hall into floor to ceiling paneled showpiece. Development raises all time weekly circuit high through Adopt a Village maneuver.

Internal: Sends out acceleration troops to Ivy City, Vogar and Inyan Wakagapi; Joseph Keveis sent out to Bombay after year's assignment in Chicago. Academy begins with over 60 around the table, over half of participants coming from international spots around the globe.

Contradiction: Reconfiguring new groupings of troops for the new quarter. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Robbins, Illinois, holds TM. The Cooperative Extension Director gives a day to TM circuiting. ICA receives HUD gift of \$154,000. Fifth City starts repainting the mural. Internal: House hosts preschool staff with ease and graciousness..

Contradiction: Building practical structures fast enough to effectively capitalize on the rise of local man. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Week of 15 evening meetings sets five Town Meeting dates and initiates seven host committees. Week II is spent in year's battleplan session with colleagues.

Internal: Renting of two rooms brings House halfway to goal of "free facility". Vickie lands temporary job.

Contradiction: Keeping all the plates spinning and starting up new ones. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: First fall TM in Nebraska is set as Norfolk sets November 19 date and decides to use four-week set up model.

Internal: As entire House sees movie "Star Wars" and celebrates with pizza, beer and conversation, all receive insights in discerning and dealing with the enemy and use of "The Force."

Contradiction: Being catalytic while knowing more and more ourselves about how to do what we see as necessary. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Metro participates in discerning what the global and area councils saw as victories for Kansas City region, then figures out what are the advantages from which we will claim those victories.

Internal: House member signs contract for ten days of consulting at \$300 per day (self-support).

Contradiction: Taking the giant steps required to get from one advantage to the next while not losing your balance and falling to the dread demons in the water below. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: ICA hosts three evenings with the Institute with focuses on GCF, HDP and tapped off with a 25 year reunion Saturday night. Trekers visit 28 new counties with positive

decisions across the board. More than 10,000 people attend Sunday in Whittier, the best yet.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

Internal: House internal structures, including morning calisthenics, full daily office for two and mobile House Church are launched this week and experienced as great boost to spirit.

Contradiction: Getting the backup and preparatory work done that will give the State Campaign enough momentum to win big in Quarter III. (Wk. 1)

Preparations for first GWF in state of Indiana continue as 23 registrations are in with more coming. Fantastic presentation and presence of Packard/Mannon team impact Indianapolis House and cadre

with the globe, GSD and particularly Global Priority Number 9, Latin American beachheads.

Internal: New intern, Janis Johnston, completes moving in. New decor goes up in yellow collegium room to tell story of global victory and collegiality. Beth Cress is sent out to Student House.

Contradiction: Tying up all loose ends and insuring a great GWF on September 17. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Town Meeting circuit teams come into focus via phone calls with a great Cincinnati/Cleveland meeting in Columbus. Youth clusters plan for Venture 21.

Internal: School schedules are finally settled and self-support is underway. Whole House takes a break and visits the overlook above the Ohio River.

Contradiction: Tying up loose ends without getting caught in those ends. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Nine Michigan Town Meetings are set for October while metro cadre assigns itself to tasks for the quarter.

Internal: The selling of a car and a stained glass window plus a colleague's contribution provide funds for new circuitmobile.

Contradiction: Maintaining Development priorities in the face of immediacies. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Bushmans do training workshops in California with physiologists from around the globe, raising House self-support funds.

Internal: Two youth arrive: Mary Poole and Genevieve Morrill. Lois Reeves is sent to El Bayad for one month.

Contradiction: Building corporateness in midst of scattered troops. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Job upgrading results in \$5000 increase in permeator salaries. Development models are initiated. First New York metro planning meeting is held.

Internal: Order life manual in hand, House makes shift to missional task teams.

Contradiction: Maintaining the tension between followthru on task accomplishment and increasing metro engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Three TM yeses are secured in West Virginia as a part of the initial south phalanx of the area maneuver.

Internal: Participation at ecclesiola includes Development team member, Ruth Marshall and young Harvard Divinity school graduate.

Contradiction: Engaging all the troop on all fronts. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: "Vast Aquisition Maneuver" has begun in the Northern Division, the New York Theatre with 52 towns visited and 21 yeses this past week. Decisions emerge from the tri-metro forces to circuit.

Contradiction: Trusting the shadow principle as the key dynamic in getting all the plates spinning for the coming year. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: This week yields three new commitments to circuiting for the Town Meeting Campaign.

Internal: House procures the community recreation center and printing facilities in preparation for logistic/debriefing weekend.

Contradiction: Enabling colleagues to see they are the Spirit Movement not that the Spirit Movement is something to get involved in. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Calling metro colleagues to come to metro meeting reveals many yeses and a great hunger for engagement.

Internal: Report from Richmond after the first week of circuiting gives all an excited sense of participation.

Contradiction: Feeling overwhelmed by the practical while knowing that this is never a contradiction. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

Internal: Job upgrading nets \$1500 immediate increase and cuts permeation travel time by more than one hour a day.

House Church with 21 persons is a great celebration, including ITI grad, Inyong Dhang, and his new wife from Korea, who live in Hartford and attend the Korean Methodist Church here.

Contradiction: Engaging metro circuiters in northern division campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: House visits seven new counties for Town Meeting and returns to three. Eight yeses are secured from 19 towns. Five metro folk participate in circuits. Sheraton Hotel is inkinded for Albany Assembly and paper and printing for 47,000 New York campaign flyers.

Internal: Significant meetings with metro colleagues on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday reveal deep willingness to take responsibility for campaign. as local forces pick up logistics task for New York Campaign.

Contradiction: Engaging residue of good will from previous campaigns. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Sixty-four yeses have been accumulated by the Northern Division, two in counties which have already held TMs. House hosts the Outreach Commission of Sudbury United Methodist Church, and presents "Adopt a Village" proposal.

Internal: Social Process triangles make a fantastic voyage to the world: bums make off with discarded three-dimensional social process montages and are observed commenting on the pictures. Later the same day the triangles are discovered in use as the center item in a neighborhood store window.

Contradiction: Initiating crucial communication for the replenishing of supplies on the front lines. (Wk. 1)

Internal: Sends out Keller family. Jennifer Robins graduates to high school. More guests show up for House Church than House members, with all deciding to go to GRA and one to Lorne for summer.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Seaway Maneuver is carried on as 22 visits are made in seven countries.

Internal: Sunday morning planning session of Ottawa and Montreal Houses mobilize all troops and reveals that there is

Lorne Day, held August 27, hosts people from all over New Brunswick, contacted through New Day New Brunswick Community Forum maneuver, allowing Lorne residents to host the province and celebrate the opening of the sawmill, expanded preschool and to display hooked mats and the credit union.

Internal: The question of where to put 20 new people helps find inkind Boy Scout camp. Families begin moving from the hockey rink shack in preparation for the colder weather and hockey season.

Contradiction: Creating possibility out of overwhelmedness. (Wk. 11)

Internal: House sends out Ruth Palmer of the Trinidad Cadre, who spent her six-week's vacation helping in the Cano Negro HDP. Two youth from Caracas continue helping in the HDP Project during their vacation.

Contradiction: Creating corporate visible signs. (Wk. 11)

The week's breakthrough has been in the arena of the increasing mobility and reconfiguration of Centrum troops with a multiplicity of assignments as special task forces that have been called in and out of being to move the campaigns forward. The key contradiction has to do with creating and integrating decor and maneuver working boards.
