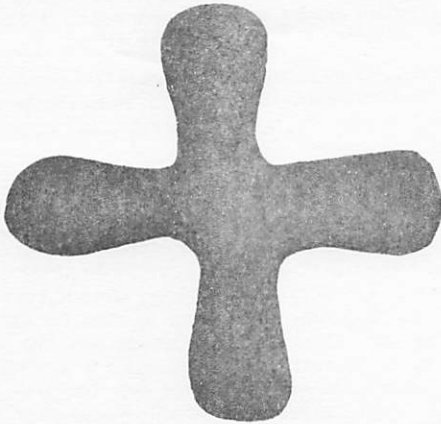

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Charringtons' Brewery agrees to lease a building for six months, rent free, for the small industry complex. Three Powerhouse workers agree to go to the Tairgwaith Consult. The third edition of the London Area monthly newsletter is published. Development brings in over \$400. British Petroleum donates a racing car set on two 4' X 8' tables.

Internal: Bridge House renovation continues: the Guild Hall rug is thrown out, the floor reconstructed from grass roots up and painted blue (paint donated by ship repair company next door.) Huang Hsing Peng is sent to Ghana for a ten-day training program.

Contradiction: Turning practical Project wins into all island victories. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Visits with top administrative officials in Lothian and Central regions pave the way for TMs in untouched areas.

Internal: House celebrates with Area London in a glittering congregational dinner the pending marriage of Alan Berresford and Fiona Willock.

Contradiction: Holding the one thrust that motivates and beckons everyone's participation. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: One fourth of the village of Tairgwaith is involved in set-up for HDP Consult. Printing equipment is secured. Local residents plan sign to welcome all to Consult.

Internal: Ann Pring arrives with car and catering expertise to join Ross Stuart and both hit the road to inkind for the Consult.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum while winning on every front. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Models, materials, inkind car and appointments signal the preparation for Town Meeting England.

Listen to my words.

Newcastle's "Robin Hood" gang leap frog twelve miles as Development scheme for Indian village adoption.

Internal: House is the envy of all on motorway as it travels in black London-type taxi to and from Area Council. At last the time has come for TM: England as Council builds the model that will enable 30 TMs to be held across England. House sends Dianne Greenwald to Tairgwaith Consult and receives Jean Taylor back from Scotland.

Contradiction: Accelerating through all the ambiguous mire of planning and preparing, to achieve the speed of light. (Wk. 1)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Northern Circuit sets up three Forum Communautaires in three new regions.

Internal: Easter week sees many new changes: Dominique Mathiot sent out to Wales for Tairgwaith Consult, Doris and Charles Hahn's arrival for Management trek, a new bedroom created out of an old hallway, a new utility shed built, and a great quarter celebrated with Viet Nameese food.

Contradiction: Finishing crucial jobs that are almost done. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: Local man starts work in furniture factory as umbrella production begins. Termine Industries and Education Termine inkind 20 blue work uniforms. Three religious orders phone to have checks picked up on the 31st of the month.

Internal: House sends Averys to Maliwada Training School. Michael Deloughery starts teaching at University of L'Agula.

Contradiction: Changing gears in the midst of over-abundant possibility. (Wk. 1)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-LJEDE HDP

External: Bricks arrive from Nigerian Clay Products for the street light generator house, sparking spontaneous truck unloading event in which 40 ljeleans participate. The generator is begun by 12 ljele citizens assigned by the coordinator's meeting and is completed on Saturday. The United States embassy sends political attache, Joe Lake, and cultural specialist, Sam Thompson, for a great site visitation.

Internal: Peter Malaba arrives on reassignment from Lusaka to Lagos. Staff goes to lje-Bode swimming hole for afternoon celebration following the four great visibility work day.

Contradiction: Building momentum toward final victory in June by working on visible signs. (Wk. 13)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Economic trek debriefs. Reports on European treks shed light on "three pillars of GSD" and bridge gaps between operating screens and principles.

Internal: Quarter's celebration amid Holy Week is strange but good with putting away the purple for a night and delving into "Close Encounters" movie. The artform conversation was welcomed like an old friend.

Contradiction: Keeping track of the whirl of maneuvers while remembering that the four centrums are one. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Meetings in two provinces move campaign closer to turning Belgium gold.

Internal: Collegiums on maneuvers and economic treks keep House spinning about demonstrations.

Contradiction: Moving bureaucratic decision-making on to timeline. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: North Holland circuit yields two provinces preparing for Dorpsdag, Rotary and Rotary wives' clubs ready to receive proposals of \$100 to \$4,000 and major introductory authorization letter from Rotary to a all Dutch chapters.

Internal: Tillich study at ecclesiola gives opportunity to think through Town Meeting as revelatory experience.

Contradiction: Building the tactical implementation system which allows all troops to do required maneuver follow-up. (Wk. 10)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Treks travel to the north and the south, with the Vienna/Munich circuit recruiting two for Wales Consult and possible intern family. The trek sets up a work camp for the Wales Project and does preliminary work on two LENS courses and village TMs. The trek to Ruhr sets up one more meeting in that area and makes arrangement for the rally on April 11. Town Meeting in one small section of a highrise model city is a great event with 70 adults present as well as 70 children.

Internal: Continental Development PSU participation in Brussels begins a week concentrating on caring for colleagues across Germany with mailings for the Wales Consult and the Guardians Consult.

Contradiction: Maximizing effectiveness of upcoming training events with students of college for social pedagogy. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The pen used by five Kreuzberg Ost residents to sign the contract for the new community center is auctioned off for 186 marks to go to the center's renovation. Children's after school program goes to the theater. Elders give 160 marks plus inkind curtains, and supplies for the new center. Funding for the new center looks promising as the city expresses interest in German tutoring classes for children of guest workers.

Internal: Paul Evans visits House on way from Kamveleni and Kapini! Consults to Tairgwaith Consult and does slide show for guild. Oylers visit Kreuzberg Ost, possibly for the last time before moving to new assignment in ljele. House spends Good Friday in quarter planning session.

Contradiction: Finding the overall images that give focus to a quarter filled with doing six major maneuvers, continuing and expanding ongoing programs and maintaining emphasis on GCF and Development. (Wk. 13)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI

External: Kapini HDP is launched with 700 at the Consult Opening and 125 daily from 7:00 on. Outside consultants swell to 35, including three from Shantumbu who have joined the staff. One consultant loaned two tractors and ploughs to the demonstration farm, which now has 19 seed beds of assorted vegetables planted over one acre. Expert Johannes Ochilles Mutoka arrived from Kawangware to gun Farming Guild. All six guilds are moving into full-day action the first week, with 50 present at 7:00 collegiums. Community Kitchen serves 220 lunches each day to village, including 150 preschoolers now in second week with nine locally trained teachers. Steven Muyaule from Shantumbu launches the preschool training. Brick factory produc 174 soil-cement bricks in one day. The construction crew digs the foundation for the 13 room auxiliary training center. the Health Guild does full survey of the village as it works toward a health fair in three weeks. Ten stake women are accepted for residential midwifery course in Kabwe. The first tent store opens with bread and basics.

Internal: The Consult holds feast of endings at the Intercontinental Hotel with Joseph Kameme as the m.c.

Contradiction: Getting the community structures operating to channel the energy released by the Consult. (Wk. 13)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Successful firing of 10,000 brick kiln launches regular production and marketing, and is marked with celebration at the factory, complete with dancing. The guilds spend four hours planning for Quarter IV. The desert plot is green with a variety of plants. A successful fish catch is ready for stocking cages in the river. The elders' feeding program is begun.

Internal: Dr. and Mrs. Alex Neill visit with sons Alex and Ken. Kenya colleagues, Benedette and Humphry, come for a month in Bayad on the way home from the HDTs in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Getting comprehensive form around new push from the community elicited by the presence of trucks, successful brick burn and the marmalade industry. (Wk. 13)

## NAIROBI

### RELISIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: District officer, Mr. Mingji, visits ICA staff during his educational leave. After waiting many months for both

ICA registration and electricity, we receive both this week. Guardians' money is broken loose in a telephone blitz for Academy travel. University family leaves 500 Kenya shillings and takes large-item inkind list back to Holland. Mr. Maiga, Under-secretary in Vice President's office, gives money for Academy travel and writes letter which brings immediate results from Immigration office in the form of a passport. Mr. Kimonge, Kawangware's District Coop Officer, makes plans to attend GRA. Ann Muthoni is selected to represent Kawangware Coop Society at Women's Coop Conference. Kawangware Market Committee donates 5,000 Kenya shillings to Kawangware Day Nursery School.

Internal: Kenya Religious Houses gather for planning and engage in traditional Order spirit life using the canonical hours, fasting and feast. Joseph Kameme is sent off to Brussels for Development by way of Wales Consult. House consenses on and picks up new assignments for posts, commissions and teams.

Contradiction: Moving from "life as usual" to now or never fresh burst toward completion. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI-KAMWELENI HDP**  
External: Kamwelini Clinic is established with official government register of patients for the regular visits of the mobile health unit. Health education on nutrition and water purification is given while patients wait their turn. Sleeve industry assumes responsibility for transportation of finished goods. New participants add their eagerness to the literacy classes. Construction apprentices anticipate first contract as they do cost analysis of water tank. Special harambeek work-day puts roof on standard 2 classroom.

Internal: Easter weekend is spent in joint planning with Kawangware for area maneuvers. Joseph Kameme visits Kamweleni to get first-hand reports for Europe.

Contradiction: Overcoming the mindset that planting time interferes with the project. (Wk. 1)

## BOMBAY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP**  
External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige) married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY**  
External: House inkind 40 reams of paper, plastic pitchers, glasses, crockery, watermelon and a continuous supply of hot Indian dinners. Tata assigns its representative to Chikhale. Patrons Odyssey visits Bombay on the way to Maliwada.

Internal: Final ecclesiola for Quarter is celebrated with the study of Gandhi's paper on "Village Reconstruction." House rallies in a collegium on "Principles of Winning."

Contradiction: Accelerating the last 100 meters of the inkind mile race during Continental Council and post-council preparation. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP**  
External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 60 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP**  
External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI**  
External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP**  
External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspur to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP**  
External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP**

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP**

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins ProZ5ct battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP**

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP**

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: A broad sweep of the western district for site selection clarifies the issue of proximity and of villages in need. The drive for funding HDTS participants continues.

Internal: House sends out Vivian Paul and Anthony Paul with four other to HDTS. After fasting, House and metro colleagues celebrate Hoily, traditional Hindu harvest festival, by throwing 500 liters of colored water on each other and

feasting in the home of an orthodox Hindu colleague.

Contradiction: Wrestling with the issue of finding a village sufficiently accessible that also has catalytic potential for development. (Wk. 13)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP**

External: A trek to Vijaywada, the cyclone area, secures a contract for nutri-food produced in Nadiapur. The state of Banhof, Hyderabad, gives blanket permission for village well loans. The Chairman of Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company commits half of his talk at annual meeting to NHDP. The government gives 11,600 rupees to construct a preschool and community kitchen complex with a women's activity center.

Internal: Staff welcomes a retired nurse who, after one day in the Project, decides to intern. The final stages of the new House for the auxiliary is accelerated by a shramdan constructing a compound wall and plastering the walls.

Contradiction: Keeping the common vision of Nava Gram Prayas while finding the cutting edge which allows the Project to stand alone. (Wk. 10)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: House does final line-up of sponsors for Singapore registration.

Internal: Completed internal planning smooths entry into Quarter IV. House finally sends out Jayasekaras to HDTS: Australia.

Contradiction: Hobbling on one leg with Management demands continuing and Management team in Sydney. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-KOTA KINABALU HDP**

External: Wong, authorization figure for Serusup HDP, returns from visit to Sungai Lui with strong push for district involvement. The Institute becomes known as an organization in Sabah as staff attend Jaycee Fair on invitation from Safari Manam of Sabah Foundation. GWF recruitment possible for Kuala Lumpur.

Internal: House corporately writes funding proposal and sees movie "Wrath of God" while waiting.

Contradiction: Getting final authorization O.K. to allow consult prep to go into full swing. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP**

External: Leadership meeting (now celebration committee) to begin planning of first anniversary includes 20 youth and representatives from all stakes and guilds. Distribution of inkind T-shirts with Sungai Lui grids signals unveiling of new preschool uniforms, purple pants and skirts now dot the village.

Internal: Global team arrives revealing new possibility. House pushes through victories in Indonesian strategy and sends out

site selection team and staff to Sabah. All experience the deep address of Gandhi at ecclesiola.

**Contradiction:** Activating the visible sign of the entire community's consensus through the anniversary, demonstrating that Sungai Lui is one Project. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP**  
External: Villagers demonstrate new initiative as they build number six and seven MCK or public water facilities and help cook, sell and buy daily self-supporting nutritious meals.

**Internal:** Kelapa Dua, one and a half hours from Jakarta on a very bumpy, muddy road, has become a very visible and visitable Project, as House receives new intern, Rochmat Djatmiko from Central Java and visitors from World Bank, Indonesian Planning Board and Treasury Department visit. Roy and Bea Roamer and Louise Singelton from Denver leave for Bombay.

**Contradiction:** Catalyzing village leadership to create consensus for the future. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**  
External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

**Internal:** Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness.

**Contradiction:** Waiting for concrete data before building an implementable battleplan. (Wk. 8)

## HONG KONG

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**  
External: House launches development treks in Hong Kong and Seoul and attends breakfast Guardian meeting in Seoul. Very good article on Nam Wai appears in Hong Kong newspaper. Peter Hu attends elders' meeting at Nam Wai.

**Internal:** House attends Maundy Thursday service to celebrate Easter. Rafos spins of Year of Management and leaves for Seoul.

**Contradiction:** Enabling SEAPAC to act as one continent. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP**  
External: Eighty children draw intestinal worms during a drawing competition sponsored by Pfizer. The factory has to move to a larger facility as production jumps by 60%. The first crop of mushroom appear gloriously as the end of the second experiment is near. Youth meet more seriously and elect officers to carry out their vision. A Chinese textile firm contributes 1,000 US in Development trek.

**Internal:** Two jobs are secured after many weeks of searching. Wong Ching On returns from HDTs in Korea.

**Contradiction:** Meeting the urgency to have more troops as Project demands intensify and coordination of activities becomes more complex with the approach of summer. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP**  
External: Auxiliary hosts two sets of V.I.P.s in two days, 50 women from Kaohsiung on Friday an; mayor Ko of Ping Tung county and Commissioner Tsiang of the Joint Committee on Rural Reconstruction on Saturday.

**Internal:** Auxiliary receives Katherine Cheng back from Korea and expends itself in trash burning, street sweeping until Hai Ou is the cleanest village in Taiwan.

**Contradiction:** Meeting the village mindset of take-no-risks with confident action and an out-to-win style. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**  
External: Filipinas Foundation of the Ayala Group funds first year budget of the Business Development Enterprise of the Langub HDP.

**Internal:** CSIII is taught to Cainta Catholic School teachers, reminding the Order of its witness on vocation and covenant.

**Contradiction:** Seeing that the fullness of time is not at the moment of "can" but at the point of "will." (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**  
External: House hosts Chinese/English RS-I with 40 participants.

**Internal:** Area Council prep and RS-I prep result in more guests than House members at breakfasts.

**Contradiction:** Shifting interested friends into engaged colleagues. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP**

**Internal:** House agonizes over question of "What would happen if the staff left today." Linda Knutsen is sent out to help prepare for Area Council. Mrs. Ivalee McCord visits on her way to the United States from India.

**Contradiction:** Correcting methodological amnesia. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO-LANGUB HDP**  
External: Regular sitio (stake) meetings with 136 in attendance across the community highlighted a short working week as everyone prepared for the Holy Week celebrations and the Elementary School graduation and closing for vacation.

**Internal:** Four days of Holy Week discontinuity mark the completion of Quarter IV planning.

**Contradiction:** Gearing back up to full speed after discontinuity in the midst of a "summer-time" mindset. (Wk. 1)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**  
External: Two local residents collect \$200 for a bus trip for the elders in Sanya, after saying that it was impossible to raise money from Japanese this way.

**Internal:** The area logistics team meets in Tokyo to plan maneuvers for the quarter.

**Contradiction:** Taking the programs seriously without building serious maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP**  
External: New breeding plan of sows in the village nets the first litter with six piglets. The foundation of four new homes

are started. The university English class holds a work day in the village. Villagers cement plaza pond wall and drainage ditch. Continued interest of Jeju City professional men solidifies with the first meeting of the Kwangyung Guardians. The village declared the arrival of spring with the preschool parents making brightly colored curtains for the school, contracting with new village to open the repair center, employing new clerk at the trading post, spring cleaning at the bath house.

Internal: Bob Rafos passes through Jeju on his way to Chicago and excites House and renews global vision with news of the 16 priorities.

Contradiction: Creating a long-range plan for getting the resources together to enable economic industrial development. (Wk. 13)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Governor Kim of Kang Wong Do agrees to be on the host committee for the Kuh Du 2 Ri consultation and to attend the opening ceremonies. Villagers finish the walls of the new village hall and begin on the slab roof. Development continues throughout the week in Seoul with an inkind office as a major target.

Internal: House welcomes colleague from Tokyo, packs materials room for moving to Kuh Du 2 Ri and new Seoul office and has dinner with Hames McBurney, brother of George McBurney, here on business.

Contradiction: Being in three places at once requires extraordinary lightness of spirit, mind and body. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Visits to prefecture towns using Guilders' calling model offers promising possibilities of setting up Chiki Kon Dankais as we get first two solid ITI recruits.

Internal: EG experiences wonder of Shin Kan Sen tour, as baptism at local Catholic Church and finding two infant care volunteers fill full school vacation week.

Contradiction: Ordering chaos in external and internal life as House moves into new arenas. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A story about Oyubari and ICA around the world, written for Bando Chemical Publications, began as a \$200 self-support tactic and became a fresh new way to tell the ICA story to Japanese businessmen.

Internal: House makes internal life plans with study and spirit life emphasis on global contexting for staff and colleagues.

Contradiction: Ordering chaos in internal operations while making the most of exciting breaklooses in external mission. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Cross-country-ski trail blazing-weekend charts the Oyubari course with local forestry department skier, head of the Sapporo Cross-country Ski Club providing the needed expertise to do the blazing! Auxiliary helps local farmer put up large (long as a football field) vinyl house to begin melon plants. Two circuit teams go out on the Wakkanai and Romoi circuits for Chiki Kon don Kai as area logistics task force completes two weeks here. Fourteen international high school students from Tokyo spend vacation working in Oyubari. Their presence breaks open new possibilities, e.g., elders care.

Internal: Mitsuko Kowasaki returns to Fukuoka after six-week sojourn. Maneuver writing for Quarter IV explodes with the reading of Global Trek report and helpful session talking through the Hokkaido 40 with Area Logistics. Day of

discontinuity and then Sunday night House Church 'Feast of Beginnings' launches House into new quarter. Three groups from Tokyo drop in to take a look at OHDP.

Contradiction: Taking the tactical steps to release new life in stakes and guilds. (Wk. 1)

## SYDNEY

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The regional set-up team of Murrin Bridge HDP for the third week in a row is carrying the fruits of the week's inkind to set up auxiliary in Project and prepare for Consult. National authorization visits with Apex and Jaycees, lay ground work for task force implementation for MHDP Consult, HDTS and Queensland new site.

Internal: Garnet Banks give SEAPAC report. House sends out John Telford to Tasmania CMA maneuver. Area House is transformed into war camp for March - April maneuver with five new area squads in operation.

Contradiction: Discovering new sources to release \$100,000 for present dreamtime - Wunan maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

Internal: David is sent on area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as areal demands shift. (Wk. 10)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: GWF allows women to be "Queens for a day." The first of 12 new houses is started. Community holds meeting to limit credit at Kitco with great results and a visit by the community health director ends with a new friend for Oombulgurri. One staff and three community people go to Department of Aboriginal Affairs' bookkeepers course. Three community people and Ken Otto go to Murrin Bridge Consult. Friendly visit from DAA and a new bookkeeper bring hopes of easing the financial tension.

Internal: Auxiliary maintain two cows in Wyndham on a rotational milking schedule. Two ICA babies are given bush names, Andrew Baker is Gullaroo (Rainbow) and Adam Brown is Daddaway Lungamari (an old man's name who used to live at a waterhole called Daddaway)

Contradiction: Directing community momentum toward the HDTS. (Wk. 13)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: A trek to Torke Peninsula launches the state campaign as a Monalta Community Meeting is held in the suburbs on the same day as the Adelaide GWF. Youth raise \$27 toward Oombulgurri Youth Trek.

Internal: David White breezes through again; GWF team leaves.

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

Contradiction: Keeping the state campaign moving while the Murrin Bridge Consult looms. (Wk. 12)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: House secures factory for inkind prefab of HDTs tables. Week II trek to Murrin Bridge includes three Oombulgurri men and Maxine. Speakers to Myrtleford Apex experience six-car relay trip after brakes fail on House car.

Internal: Two guests and all Oombulgurri youth become fully engaged in charting and study of ecclesiola paper on "the new missionary." Inkind file cabinet claims the promise of order in the chaos of House files.

Contradiction: Prioritizing multiple demands in order to win with all of them. (Wk. 12)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Murrin Bridge HDP Consult opens Easter Weekend under tent with 250 present--almost every adult, teenager and child present. HDTs funding search continues in Perth.

Internal: Banks Family participates in Consult with Rebecca cooking, Ingrid assisting with Emerging Generation structures. Sandra Blaik's, Jeremiah Cock's babysitter, visa is cleared for one year volunteer service in the Philippines.

Contradiction: Enabling HDTs site to be constructed and funding released prior to date of starting. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: GWF with 30 present represents 20 womens' organizations. Phoning and recruitment continue for the Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: Emerging Generation leaves for colleagues' home and adults go to Murrin Bridge Consult.

Contradiction: Treading into the unknown to build solid new networks in Queensland. (Wk. 13)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

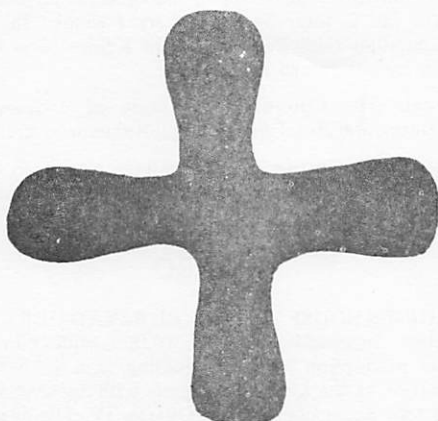

joined the staff. One consultant loaned two tractors and ploughs to the demonstration farm, which now has 19 seed beds of assorted vegetables planted over one acre. Expert Johannes Ochilles Mutoka arrived from Kawangware to gun Farming Guild. All six guilds are moving into full-day action the first week, with 50 present at 7:00 collegiums. Community Kitchen serves 220 lunches each day to village, including 150 preschoolers now in second week with nine locally trained teachers. Steven Muyaule from Shantumbu launches the preschool training. Brick factory produces 174 soil-cement bricks in one day. The construction crew digs the foundation for the 13 room auxiliary training center. the Health Guild does full survey of the village as it works toward a health fair in three weeks. Ten stake women are accepted for residential midwifery course in Kabwe. The first tent store opens with bread and basics.

Internal: The Consult, holds feast of endings at the Intercontinental Hotel with Joseph Kameme as the M.C.

Contradiction: Getting the community structures operating to channel the energy released by the Consult. (Wk. 13)

**CAIRO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Successful firing of 10,000 brick kiln launches regular production and marketing, and is marked with celebration at the factory, complete with dancing. The guilds spend four hours planning for Quarter IV. The desert plot is green with a variety of plants. A successful fish catch is ready for stocking cages in the river. The elders' feeding program is begun.

Internal: Dr. and Mrs. Alex Neill visit with sons Alex and Ken. Kenya colleagues, Benedette and Humphry, come for a month in Bayad on the way home from the HDTS in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Getting comprehensive form around new push from the community elicited by the presence of trucks, successful brick burn and the marmalade industry. (Wk. 13)

**NAIROBI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: Broad base support for week includes money for Kawangware day nursery school from Esso. Peace Corps provides Kamweleni Preschool with supplies. Ministry of Finance writes letter giving its blessing to Kamweleni Project, receiving money from Canadian High Commission. Community Development officer reads of ICA registration in Kenya Gazette. Now he will move with VM. Sewing Class women are sent for interviews at New Ocean Furniture.

Health education on nutrition and water purification is given while patients wait their turn. Sleeve industry assumes responsibility for transportation of finished goods. New participants add their eagerness to the literacy classes. Construction apprentices anticipate first contract as they do cost analysis of water tank. Special harambee work-day puts roof on standard 2 classroom.

Internal: Easter weekend is spent in joint planning with Kawangware for area maneuvers. Joseph Kameme visits Kamweleni to get first-hand reports for Europe.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP)**

**Contradiction:** Overcoming the mindset that planting time interferes with the project. (Wk. 1)

**BOMBAY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP**

**External:** President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

**Internal:** House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige) married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

**Contradiction:** Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY**

**External:** The 50% deductions for donors is granted for three years. 100% deductions are assured for June 1. Large representations come from the penvale section for Consults. Development Circuit to Pune raises 15,000 rupees plus two motor cycles and one typewriter. Month closes with highest monthly total of the year.

**Internal:** Gayle and Paul Thompson arrive in Bombay on their way to new assignment, Desmond, Ann and Joan Avery arrive on their way to the Human Development Training School in Maliwada. **Internal:** The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

**Contradiction:** Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP**

**External:** Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

**Internal:** Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

**Contradiction:** Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP**

**External:** Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village

reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

**Internal:** House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries Ranganath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

**Contradiction:** Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP**

**External:** State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

**Internal:** New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

**Contradiction:** Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP**

**External:** First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

**Internal:** Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

**Contradiction:** Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

**Contradiction:** Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP**

**External:** Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP) organization in Sabah as staff attend Jaycee Fair on invitation from Safari Manam of Sabah Foundation. GWF recruitment possible for Kuala Lumpur.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

## DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: A broad sweep of the western district for site selection clarifies the issue of proximity and of villages in need. The drive for funding HDTs participants continues.

Internal: House sends out Vivian Paul and Anthony Paul with four others to HDTs. After fasting, House and metro colleagues celebrate Hoily, traditional Hindu harvest festival, by throwing 500 liters of colored water on each other and feasting in the home of an orthodox Hindu colleague.

Contradiction: Wrestling with the issue of finding a village sufficiently accessible that also has catalytic potential for development. (Wk. 13)

Contradiction: Hobbling on one leg with Management demands continuing and Management team in Sydney. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Wong, authorization figure for Serusup HDP, returns from visit to Sungai Lui with strong push for district involvement. The Institute becomes known as an

organization in Sabah as staff attend Jaycee Fair on invitation from Safari Manam of Sabah Foundation. GWF recruitment possible for Kuala Lumpur.

Internal: House corporately writes funding proposal and sees movie "Wrath of God" while waiting.

Contradiction: Getting final authorization O.K. to allow consult prep to go into full swing. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Leadership meeting (now celebration committee), to begin planning of first anniversary, includes 20 youth and representatives from all stakes and guilds. Distribution of inkind T-shirts with Sungai Lui grids signals unveiling of new preschool uniforms, purple pants and skirts now dot the village.

Internal: Two jobs are secured after many weeks of

The village declared the arrival of spring with the preschool parents making brightly colored curtains for the school, contracting with new village to open the repair center, employing new clerk at the trading post, spring cleaning at the bath house.

Internal: Bob Rafos passes through Jeju on his way to Chicago and excites House and renews global vision with news of the 16 priorities.

Contradiction: Creating a long-range plan for getting the resources together to enable economic industrial development. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-KUH DU 2 RI HDP**  
External: Governor Kim of Kang Wong Do agrees to be on the host committee for the Kuh Du 2 Ri consultation and to attend the opening ceremonies. Villagers finish the walls of the new village hall and begin on the slab roof. Development continues throughout the week in Seoul with an in-kind office as a major target.

Internal: House welcomes colleague from Tokyo, packs materials room for moving to Kuh Du 2 Ri and new Seoul office and has dinner with Hames McBurney, brother of George McBurney, here on business.

Contradiction: Being in three places at once requires extraordinary lightness of spirit, mind and body. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**  
External: Staff continues on one day a week calling to set up Chiiki Kandankai planning meetings in Fukuoka prefecture.

Internal: Returning sojourner from Oyubari, Ms. Kawasaki, comes to work with guild and helps hunt for new house for June.

Contradiction: Keeping balance between flexibility and rigidity. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**  
External: Town Meeting moves ahead. In the midst of a call on Osaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry man, he gets up and sets an appointment with a corresponding Chamber man in Wakayama City.

Internal: Visitor at ecclesiola comes back on Saturday to learn more about ICA work and stays for workshop on quarter's House decor.

Contradiction: Creating the rhythm of engagement that produces harmony of colleagues and task. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP**

Area Council held at Murrin Bridge HDP site designs upcoming maneuvers, and celebrates 41 awakenment events with 2816 participants during Quarter III.

Internal: House participates in first ecclesiola in Quarter IV, launches "Operation Squirt," for new House location and sends Don and Janet Baker to Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Discerning the forces and operational patterns that will allow breakthroughs to the new intensity demanded. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: GWF allows women to be "Queens for a day." The first of 12 new houses is started. Community holds meeting to limit credit at Kitco with great results and a visit by the community health director ends with a new friend for Oombulgurri. One staff and three community people go to Department of Aboriginal Affairs' bookkeepers course. Three community people and Ken Otto go to Murrin Bridge Consult. Friendly visit from DAA and a new bookkeeper bring hopes of easing the financial tension.

Contradiction: Enabling HDTs site to be constructed and funding released prior to date of starting. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: GWF with 30 present represents 20 womens' organizations. Phoning and recruitment continue for the Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: Emerging Generation leaves for colleagues' home and adults go to Murrin Bridge Consult.

Contradiction: Treading into the unknown to build solid new networks in Queensland. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: Fifty consultants and eighty local community people, plus a hundred community Emerging Generation, make the Murrin Bridge Consult a profound event. Internal: House sends three of eight staff members to the outer islands (Ailinglaplap, Jabor, and Namu - with a stop in Ebeye, Kwajalein Atoll) for Town Meeting Circuits and TASC outer-island service on the first three-week leg of three major Town Meeting circuits this quarter (IV).

Contradiction: Keeping the Spirit alive in the midst of transforming the participants into the leaders and recruiters. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Governor Peter Coleman invites the Institute to visit him in American Samoa to discuss HDP.

Internal: Alyce Cather readies equipment for first Samoan language GCF as charts, manuals, and triangles are translated into Samoan.

Contradiction: Having patience while village high chiefs decide participation in HDP and Global Village Meeting set-up maneuver moves along. (Wk. 2)

## SAN FRANCISCO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Richgrove, California, holds community meeting and decides with whole-hearted enthusiasm to be a Human Development Project.

Internal: External and internal maneuvering build a base for an extraordinary quarter.

Contradiction: Seeing selves as catalysts that elicit a broad spectrum of colleague participation rather than an impossibly overwhelmed handfull. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

Contradiction: Heraldng the news to the whole region of victories and action that require participation fast enough so that all can ride the momentous waves breaking forth in California. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Combating the summer doldrums--already. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Consultant recruitment confirms 12, with tactics, including a report on Guatemala site selection by Armando Divas and two slide shows.

Internal: House welcomes Development and sends out five to Area Council, Phil Devor to Academy, Kathy Lowther to HDTS: Caracas and Kim Alire to TM: South Dakota campaign. Tracey Ann Speicher is born at 3430 grams and 53 centimeters.

Contradiction: Increasing programmatic momentum with House personnel down to two people. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY--INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Locally designed, constructed and installed street signs become a symbol of new hope and demonstrate once again that any situation can be dealt with.

The key contradiction lies in the arena of risking creation of the transparent machinery which objectifies the simplicity of the resolve and leads Development out of the complexity of the middle ground.

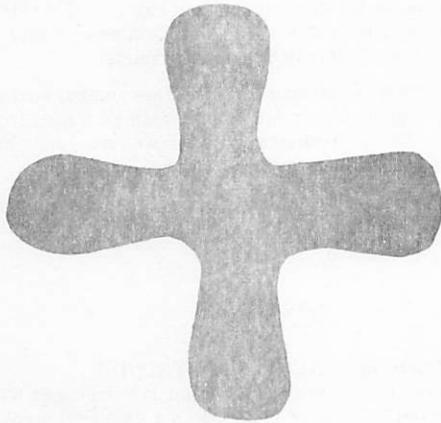

A Wales Consult participant, Fran Schotola, gives an exciting report on the Consult and the village of Tairgwaith.

Internal: House receives dozens of glasses of all shapes and sizes from the new Holiday Inn. The Emerging Generation visits for the last time to the famous Frankfurt Zoo before the Oyler Family leave for Ijede.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues into active guardianship roles. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Andus Electronics notifies community resident of decision to add extra 1000 mares to its gift for the community center, while many local residents drop by the centrum to offer various inkind furnishings and equipment, resulting in a two-day inkind pickup of the gifts. Local paint company donates enough paint for the center and a Saturday workday replaces worn wallpaper and completely repaints the downstairs of the center.

Internal: First ecclesiola promises an exciting quarter with highly relevant sodality.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the major actions and enabling them to get done in the face of urgency of immediate demands. (Wk 2)

## KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: Intensive training of 20 health guilders for three weeks leads up to Saturday Health Show bringing mobile

clinic and immunizations to Kapini. An optician checks eyes and prescribes glasses. Guilders work late making colorful booths. Preschool, now 170 or 90% of the population, does demonstration classes in "Kapini Theatre" where stakes do plays, sing and dance. A clay grid with moveable houses attract many to create Kapini's space. Raffle and movies cap the day. Four stake women are sent out to Phase I of a seven month midwifery course. Over 150 babies are weighed, the total community is surveyed, and a nutrition demonstration is held for 50 ladies with new foods for children and family to taste. Cement community kitchen floor is laid. Adult literacy classes have 60 students and four eager local teachers. Lusaka businessman invites two from Commerce Guild to live-in for a week of store management training.

Internal: New interns include Vernon Hagwamuna, medical officer and ITI grad; Steven Muyaule, preschool trainer from Shantumbu; Gibson Mwaisaka, leading welfare guild; and Thomas Mwaisiye, farmers guild, also from Shantumbu.

Contradiction: Creating the roof to move under with only three weeks left until tents must be returned. (Wk. 3)

## CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: New brick factory production rate increases with pay incentive raises to over 1100 bricks a day. Free weekly dental service is initiated, marked by 10 extractions from Stake 1 patients. Preschool attendance increases by 20 students through efforts of teachers and parents.

Internal: 125 visitors from Sacre Coure Convent and McCormick Place Theological Institute visit Bayad and stay longer than planned. Week II quarter planning moves to include June 30th completion ceremonies. The offer of the use of a minibus in Cairo releases transportation funds for other missional tasks.

Contradiction: Consensing on models for next step with village ready for action. (Wk. 3)

## NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kawangware economic and social commissions begin implementation of Quarter IV battleplan. Village Meeting is held in Doldol making 28 districts, and VM date set in most remote district in Kenya, Ladivor. Guardians' HDP briefing and cocktail hours open new doors for funding and authorization. Standard 7, tutoring program for CPE test, moves into third week with 30 students; Testbook Centre and International School of Kenya give inkind books and supplies.

Internal: Anne Muthoni and Dickson Ngugi are received as interns. Anne returns from week long Women's Coop Conference, and a special celebration at her church holds promise of three combis from Colgate Palmolive. Saturday night dinner becomes a celebration as ten top tunes are selected from songbook.

Contradiction: Using the strategic method of waiting to enable others to do a job. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP

External: Harambee School workday lays 6 months worth of stone with the help of newly-trained masons. Community meeting plans next school workday to meet education contradiction, and planning is climaxed by cultural celebration. Farmers make decision to farm and market corporately and then begin to plan implementation. Demonstration nutrition garden is planted introducing groundnuts and a variety of vegetables. Local people volunteer for paramedic training; English literacy teacher

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI--KAMWELINI HDP)  
begins leading stake meetings.

Internal: Full buses and no car results in an auxiliary and villager walking home from Machakos, limiting the amount of groceries carried.

Contradiction: Achieving corporateness amidst trlocation of staff. (Wk. 3)

## BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS--MALIWADA HDP  
External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Acceleration team works a week in Chikhale. Development circuit continues developing a state-wide guardian network. State Bank of India opens doors for complete concrete cooperation with Nava Gram Prayas after a guardian introduces a team to the chairman. Sixteen new Projects are launched with Consults in less than three weeks, making a total of 44, and another 20 Projects are in the chute. Maliwada HDTS starts with 250 students and more are trying to get in.

Internal: Sandra Robinson visits House and gives a delightful report on the Aurangabad division Consults. House greets Tony Hughes from Great Britain and sends him to Chikhale for engineering advice.

Contradiction: Systematizing and coordinating massive input from State Bank of India, government and private sector, all of which are necessary and available. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR--KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH--VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the

Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI--KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON--TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI--UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI--SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON -- ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON-ANJANGAON HDP)  
equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

## DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: A broad sweep of the western district for site selection clarifies the issue of proximity and of villages in need. The drive for funding HDTs participants continues.

Internal: House sends out Vivian Paul and Anthony Paul with four other to HDTs. After fasting, House and metro colleagues celebrate Hoily, traditional Hindu harvest festival, by throwing 500 liters of colored water on each other and feasting in the home of an orthodox Hindu colleague.

Contradiction: Wrestling with the issue of finding a village sufficiently accessible that also has catalytic potential for development. (Wk. 13)

## MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company visits Nadlapur on Easter Sunday to help kick off a Hindu festival drama which 20 surrounding villages attend. Over 3500 rupees is raised locally to support the event. Mr. Atal of the tobacco company is very pleased with the progress in Nadlapur.

Internal: Paul Sumitra and Paul Dhyr leave for Consults in Maharashtra, Deomurti and Sawad, two of 16 taking place. House welcomes new auxiliary Mala Ram, N. Salve, and Narsimlu and sends out other auxiliary to new Projects, Kishore Shinde, Raju Sathe, and Jeevandas.

Contradiction: Activating the panch to take a leadership role in the village in order to balance the stake and guild dynamics. (Wk. 3)

## CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House does final line-up of sponsors for Singapore registration.

Internal: Completed internal planning smooths entry into Quarter IV. House finally sends out Jayasekaras to HDTs: Australia.

Contradiction: Hobbling on one leg with Management demands continuing and Management team in Sydney.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: The village chief of the proposed project site becomes a fast colleague when he spends two hours pressing the State Secretary for a speedy approval.

Internal: House celebrates moving into a new location with its first House Church and welcomes Mudjatmo from Kelapa Dua as the fifth member of the Project auxiliary.

Contradiction: Moving a bureaucratic committee to shape a quick yes authorizing the Project without being present at the meeting. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Leadership meeting (now celebration committee) to begin planning of first anniversary includes 20 youth and representatives from all stakes and guilds. Distribution of inked T-shirts with Sungai Lui grids signals unveiling of new preschool uniforms, purple pants and skirts now dot the village.

Internal: Global team arrives revealing new possibility. House pushes through victories in Indonesian strategy and sends out site selection team and staff to Sabah. All experience the deep address of Gandhi at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Activating the visible sign of the entire community's consensus through the anniversary, demonstrating that Sungai Lui is one Project. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: National event greatly influences future of Kelapa Dua, for Adam Malik, one of ICAs original supporters and one whose wife spoke at the Consult, is elected Vice President of Indonesia.

Internal: House celebrates great week of task force planning and setting of date for Completion Celebration for June 10, 1978.

Contradiction: Involving entire village in workday and making it a village event. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN)**

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness.

Contradiction: Waiting for concrete data before building an implementable battleplan. (Wk. 8)

**HONG KONG**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Treks leave for Tokyo, Seoul, Taipei, and Manila.

Internal: House sends out Peter Hu to Taipei. First ecclesiola of the quarter shakes all out of the rut of construct-itis.

Contradiction: Anticipating needs so momentum keeps going. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP**

External: Eighty children draw intestinal worms during a drawing competition sponsored by Pfizer. The factory has to move to a larger facility as production jumps by 60%. The first crop of mushroom appear gloriously as the end of the second experiment is near. Youth meet more seriously and elect officers to carry out their vision. A Chinese textile firm contributes 1,000 US in Development trek.

Internal: Two jobs are secured after many weeks of searching. Wong Ching On returns from HDTs in Korea.

Contradiction: Meeting the urgency to have more troops as Project demands intensify and coordination of activities becomes more complex with the approach of summer. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP**

External: New possibility for frozen shrimp and prawn processing, complete with guaranteed market will provide new industry. Inkind trip to Tainan nets 25 items of children's clothing for Hai Ou store and \$1,000 NT cash. Hai Ou's first minipark is begun behind the temple. Faculty of Kaohsiung Teachers' College help enlist college students for a Service Corps at Hai Ou this summer. 50 preschoolers travel to Kaohsiung.

Internal: Two staff don plastic waders and join the young women of the village in the pond, harvesting sea weed. House visits a marine laboratory and government demonstration of a shrimp processing plant.

Contradiction: Combining the strictly practical with far-reaching vision to bring forth the needed economic intensification. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: House launches Area Hong Kong Yellow Submarine Maneuver to color the Philippines yellow by June with war room board listing "yellow bullion" (funding/authorization), "yellow papers" (materials), "yellow birds" (staff), and "yellow fever" (set-up/implementation). The three-week 66 Forum blitz is called Yellow Frenzy.

Internal: Five-day holiday for Philippine national elections allows House three-day quarter planning while hosting Brian Smith (Canada via Langub to Cano Negro), Sandra Blaik (Australia to Sudtonggan), Don and Janet Baker (New York via Murrin Bridge), Joy Thomas (Chicago) and Art Rowe (Hong Kong).

Contradiction: Tenaciously doing the nitty-gritty to accomplish the big picture. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Development circuit in Taipei Week 2 yields US \$1500 in hand. Guardian offers to help with renewed government advocacy push after current R.O.C. election and appointments are over.

Internal: Peter Hu reports to metro colleagues and House on Korea HDTs.

Contradiction: Dealing with self-support, development and HDP support activity while keeping all programs ongoing. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Early Learning Center graduation becomes quarterly celebration for whole village as 500 people gather on Saturday night to see 39 graduates honored, receive diplomas and be welcomed by first and second grades with new level of sophistication. Night-time work enables great strides in road work as men who work during the day wield shovels. Village receives news that it will host GCF Assembly for 66 provinces of Philippines on day before its Completion Fair (June 3) with enthusiasm as footings are poured for HDTs building.

Internal: Quarter's budget is completed during Fast Day, with 10 sojourners trying to underand the fast in context of all those pesos.

Contradiction: Training eyes that can see a thousand years. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO-LANGUB HDP**

External: Community Health Forum is held with 68 enthusiastic participants, followed by the Consumers Association General Store meeting and distribution of the Langub Document in Visayan translation. Two drug companies commit displays for the Health Fair. Staff hosts visitors from Civil Engineers' Association who came by to assist on the topographical map, and Catholic Relief donates 500 bags of wheat germ. Tuesday night, a traveling sitio meeting team covers three of the five sitios.

Internal: House celebrates return of Judy Albers and Roy and Geni Philbrook from Area Council, sends out Becky Cakute to vote in her home town of Nabunturan and welcomes her back with inkinded rice.

Contradiction: Breaking through Project compartmentalization. (Wk. 3)

**TOKYO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Community Youth Forum team sets up four Forums for October. Over 19 authorization people are visited to recruit ITI. The Hong Kong Development team breaks loose Japanese organizations for major funding. Set-up is held by all teams for the Guardian Meeting, crowned by a great Japanese Guardians' Consult.

Internal: Teams fill the House with Tokyo Area Logistics and ITI teams. Hong Kong Development team, Global Youth Forum team from Chicago (Mark Jewel and Kim Rafos), Mr. Tonosaki and Mr. Hibino from Oyubari.

Contradiction: Holding the stance that there are no problems. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Village mayor recruits TMs at Jeju Island meeting of all mayors. Repair Shop opens for business with electric welder, metal lathe and drill press in full operation. Quarter battleplanning releases new excitement as steps become clear.

Internal: House sends out William Salmon family to Chicago and welcomes villager Lee Jung Rim as sojourner. House income and Project/TM authorization are increased as English conversation class begins with new Vice Governor of the Island.

Contradiction: Catalyzing villagers to be auxiliary dynamic in order to cover all fronts. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Task forces hold village leaders meeting in Kuh Du E Ri for consult set-up planning with the new village hall 80% completed, hold HRM in Seoul for 45 young people, visit religious orders seeking inkind office space in Seoul, receive development gift from Chartered Bank, mail 100 invitations to the Consult to companies in Seoul, and attend dinner given by Mrs. Lee Chul Kyung.

Internal: House sends out Kim Won Ho and four regional colleagues to the Academy in Chicago, sends out the William Salmon family to Chicago, welcomes Hong Kong Centrum representative and enjoys first ecclesiola of the quarter with new construct from Chicago on the first week of the quarter.

Contradiction: Operating effectively out of local laws and global principles. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House begins to probe local university ESS clubs to recruit for the coming Youth Forum team.

Internal: In the midst of teaching English staff finds time to search for new house in which to relocate.

Contradiction: Being on a train while laying the tracks, taking sharp corners alarmingly fast. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

Week II intensive gridding of Stake 4 Chitose (meaning a 1,000 years) begins preparation for actuation of six-week stake meeting model.

Internal: Celebration of Fast and the ecclesiola the same night causes reflection on being global people in a local situation is what profound humanness calls forth. Pamela Bergdall is sent to Kuh Du E Ri Consult enablement for three weeks. Bob Hanson and Molly Shaw go to Korean Consult as part of Area team.

Contradiction: Releasing creativity in a swirl of community visits in order to discern where the community is already moving. (Wk. 3)

**SYDNEY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Australia's "Women's Weekly," a magazine with circulation of five million, carries article endorsing Australian GWF trek of Quarter 3. New quarter begins with troops meeting across the Area to tie down plans for coming weeks.

Internal: The hunt for a new Sydney House intensifies.

Contradiction: Meshing the opening of new doors with consolidation of what has already been released in the previous wins of this year. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Press reporters arrive in Oombulgurri just in time for breakfast with the community in the community kitchen. They hold a nationally viewed press conference with the Aboriginals to hear what they really have to say about mining on their land. The excitement of the day lasts through the night with a midnight trip to refuel the water pump. John Huelin, director of Aboriginal Legal Aid, comes to see if Oombulgurri wants his services and what it expects from the mining companies.

Internal: The clinic sink is finally installed by John Miesen as he finds the time to do it. House hosts the new town accountant, Angus MacDonald, as he learns what a day is like in Oombulgurri. A new Oombulgurri songbook is created to use at the daily community breakfast.

Contradiction: Finding that the success of the guilds rests on the auxiliary rather than the guild core. (Wk. 3)

Contradiction: Enabling HDTs site to be constructed and funding released prior to date of starting. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Development breaks open with visit to Toowoomba. Meeting with Apex National and State residents decide to support and initiate CMAs in North Queensland. Internal: Jill Morison secures job as housemaid in hotel which Premier frequents. Emerging Generation join community children's club. House is impacted by Quarter IV ecclesiola format.

Contradiction: Making the shift from immediate Consult mindset to doing CMAs throughout the State to secure authorization for HDP. (Wk. 3)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports receiving a check for \$1,000 for U.S. G.E. based on a recommendation from General Electric's Philippine office based on their affirmation of Sudtonggan and Langub. Two different teams received expense money this week, one from the Methodist Conference in order to visit churches for Village Adoption and another from a university to do a presentation. Singapore reports \$28,100 raised in Malaysia. Brussels receives second grant from Mimosa strengthening trend of repetitive grants from a given foundation. Work on audits reveals cruciality of in-kind as a reported resource. The contradiction lies in the arena of creating consciousness of Development responsibility throughout the whole zone at the same time empowering each team's accountability for its bottom line.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports early brooding on break-open images for Summer discloses edge to be in the arenas of Grand Strategy and Third Campaign. Necessary reports, tactical refinements and internal designs all must go on, but this Summer GRA appears to require more unity, focus and depth than is attained in the kitchen sink style of assembly. Work continues on locating the transparent metaphor for the Kingdom of God. Acceptance letters were mailed to 13 Harvard students for July-September program. The question of strategic intent is raised by response of universities to Nava Gram Prayas. The contradiction lies in the arena of clarifying the profound breakloose that has happened in our missional engagement which impedes discernment of history's mandate for next year.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports excitement focusing around recent community events. The Tairgwaith Consult document numbers 65 pages including a special focus on local leadership. A 44-hour training event for the new San Francisco and New York areas auxiliaries is held in Ivy City and Inyan Wakagapi. 800 youth attend a CYF in Milwaukee and authorization work bears fruit in the Netherlands with the first TM in Meers. The trend is to continue to build on past work as a Chicago guardian task force continues working in the Town Meeting National Report this week and GWFs in Malaysia and Indonesia are self-supporting programs. The contradiction is in the arena of turning the thrust of the servant force to engage in the total mission and communicating the victories.

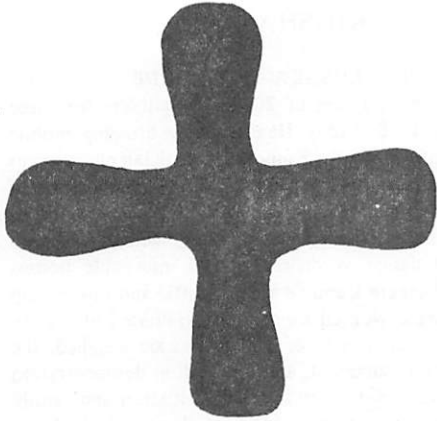
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Both are in new highrise buildings. The Maneuver is symbolically finished with a TM Rally with 35 participants from seven communities. A Wales Consult participant, Fran Schotola, gives an exciting report on the Consult and the village of Tairgwaith.

Internal: House receives dozens of glasses of all shapes and sizes from the new Holiday Inn. The Emerging Generation visits for the last time to the famous Frankfurt Zoo before the Oyler Family leave for Ijede.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues into active guardianship roles. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Andus Electronics notifies community resident of decision to add extra 1000 marcs to its gift for the community center, while many local residents drop by the centrum to offer various inkind furnishings and equipment, resulting in a two-day inkind pickup of the gifts. Local paint company donates enough paint for the center and a Saturday workday replaces worn wallpaper and completely repaints

the downstairs of the center.

Internal: First ecclesiola promises an exciting quarter with highly relevant sodality.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the major actions and enabling them to get done in the face of urgency of immediate demands. (Wk 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: Intensive training of 20 health guilders for three weeks leads up to Saturday Health Show bringing mobile clinic and immunizations to Kapini. An optician checks eyes and prescribes glasses. Guilders work late making colorful booths. Preschool, now 170 or 90% of the population, does demonstration classes in "Kapini Theatre" where stakes do plays, sing and dance. A clay grid with moveable houses attract many to create Kapini's space. Raffle and movies cap the day. Four stake women are sent out to Phase I of a seven month midwifery course. Over 150 babies are weighed, the total community is surveyed, and a nutrition demonstration is held for 50 ladies with new foods for children and family to taste. Cement community kitchen floor is laid. Adult literacy classes have 60 students and four eager local teachers. Lusaka businessman invites two from Commerce Guild to live-in for a week of store management training.

Internal: New interns include Vernon Hagwamuna, medical officer and ITI grad; Steven Muyaule, preschool trainer from Shantumbu; Gibson Mwaisaka, leading welfare guild; and Thomas Mwaisiye, farmers guild, also from Shantumbu.

Contradiction: Creating the roof to move under with only three weeks left until tents must be returned. (Wk. 3)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Forty-two tons of Portland Cement, two generators and full-time use of a minibus are inkinded from oil companies in Cairo.

Internal: House celebrates Wednesday night with GWF team.

Contradiction: Orchestrating assignments to release power around the table and in the village. (Wk. 4)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kawangware economic and social commissions begin implementation of Quarter IV battleplan. Village Meeting is held in Doldol making 28 districts, and VM date set in most remote district in Kenya, Ladivor. Guardians' HDP briefing and cocktail hours open new doors for funding and authorization. Standard 7, tutoring program for CPE test, moves into third week with 30 students; Testbook Centre and International School of Kenya give inkind books and supplies.

Internal: Anne Muthoni and Dickson Ngugi are received as interns. Anne returns from week-long Women's Coop Conference, and a special celebration at her church holds promise of three combis from Colgate Palmolive. Saturday night dinner becomes a celebration as ten top tunes are selected from songbook.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP  
Contradiction: Using the strategic method of waiting to enable others to do a job. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP  
External: Tuesday community meeting excites community leadership as they see Village Meeting method put into practical use. Coop interim committee discusses issues regarding the sleeve industry and Wednesday market days. Local health caretakers are elated with their first visits in their own stakes. Eight oxen, one oxcart and 100 people finish mud and thatch schoolroom and stone walls for permanent building. This victory was celebrated by 200 at a cultural celebration in the evening including guest traditional dancers, favorite dances, instruction in nearly forgotten dances, story telling, choir songs and youth disco.

Internal: African auxiliary assumes responsibility for providing Order training for newcomers. Movement colleagues, Godfrey and Pauline Mwereria stay for three days.

Contradiction: Building practical models for the present while waiting for auxiliary house to be built. (Wk. 4)

## BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP  
External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige) married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY  
External: Acceleration team works a week in Chikhale. Development circuit continues developing a state-wide guardian network. State Bank of India opens doors for complete concrete cooperation with Nava Gram Prayas after a guardian introduces a team to the chairman. Sixteen new Projects are launched with Consults in less than three weeks, making a total of 44, and another 20 Projects are in the Chute. Maliwada HDTs starts with 250 students and more are trying to get in.

Internal: Sandra Robinson visits House and gives a delightful report on the Aurangabad division Consults. House greets Tony Hughes from Great Britain and sends him to Chikhale for engineering advice.

Contradiction: Systematizing and coordinating massive input from State Bank of India, government and private sector, all of which are necessary and available. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP  
External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones,

making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP  
External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI  
External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahi, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP  
External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP  
External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP)**

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird walk over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP**

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inked travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP**

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediate with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP**

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP**

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole GAngapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad

Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

**DELHI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: A broad sweep of the western district for site selection clarifies the issue of proximity and of villages in need. The drive for funding HDTs participants continues.

Internal: House sends out Vivian Paul and Anthony Paul with four other to HDTs. After fasting, House and metro colleagues celebrate Hoily, traditional Hindu harvest festival, by throwing 500 liters of colored water on each other and feasting in the home of an orthodox Hindu colleague.

Contradiction: Wrestling with the issue of finding a village sufficiently accessible that also has catalytic potential for development. (Wk. 13)

**MADRAS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-N/ DLAPUR HDP**

External: Three new pairs of bullocks are purchased with newly received bank loans, in 108 degree heat! One new small temple is built and a rebuilt temple is inaugurated with all staff present in Harrijan stake. Massive invisible face lift continues while 25 full paying members initiate the new cooperative society. Translation of pre-school rituals into Telegu changes images of teachers. The final sight for the drinking water well is established.

Internal: All auxiliary spend a Sunday of discontinuity in Hyderabad seeing a new Hindi movie and eating a fine meal.

Contradiction: Holding a tension between the necessity of local control and the responsibility to adopt new techniques of operation which will change the out-moded operating image of the village as outlined in the document contradictions. (Wk. 4)

**CALCUTTA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

**SINGAPORE**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: House does final line-up of sponsors for Singapore registration.

Internal: Completed internal planning smooths entry into Quarter IV. House finally sends out Jayasekaras to HDTs: Australia.

Contradiction: Hobbling on one leg with Management demands continuing and Management team in Sydney. (Wk. 4)

... a fast collector when he spends two hours pressing the State Secretary for a speedy approval.

Internal: House celebrates moving into a new location with its first House Church and welcomes Mudjatmo from Kelapa Dua as the fifth member of the Project auxiliary.

Contradiction: Moving a bureaucratic committee to shape a quick yes authorizing the Project without being present at the meeting. (Wk. 3)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Leadership meeting (now celebration committee) to begin planning of first anniversary includes 20 youth and representatives from all stakes and guilds. Distribution of inked T-shirts with Sungai Lui grids signals unveiling of new preschool uniforms. Purple pants and skirts now dot the village.

Internal: Global team arrives revealing new possibility. House pushes through victories in Indonesian strategy and sends out site selection team and staff to Sabah. All experience the deep address of Gandhi at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Activating the visible sign of the entire community's consensus through the anniversary, demonstrating that Sungai Lui is one Project. (Wk. 11)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: National event greatly influences future of Kelapa Dua for Adam Malik, one of ICA's original supporters and one whose wife spoke at the Consult, is elected Vice President of Indonesia.

Internal: House celebrates great week of task force planning and setting of date for Completion Celebration for June 10, 1978.

Contradiction: Involving entire village in workday and making it a village event. (Wk. 3)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness.

Contradiction: Waiting for concrete data before building an implementable battleplan. (Wk. 8)

### HONG KONG

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development trek visits Taipei. House meets with international staff of ITT visiting Seoul.

Internal: House hosts Oyubari colleagues Mr. Hibino and Mr. Tonasaki while in Hong Kong and Nam Wai. House Church is celebrated with fish flown in from Taipei and mushrooms from Nam Wai.

Contradiction: Keeping abreast of current needs of the Zone. (Wk. 4)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: All phases show up for village GWF with 50 around the table. Thirty-five pounds of mushrooms are sold in first marketing venture. Two China University graduate students in business commit three summer months to work full time. HDTs: Korea grad says yes to being editor of Nam Wai

... story at village V... while second grad co-leads major presentation at Pong... College. Pilot agrees to overfly village for new P.R. brochure cover photo. In typical weekly turnout, twenty young men do quarter's timeline to enable government funding.

Internal: Mr. Tee and Mr. Habino of Japan impact House in their affirmation of Oyubari and Nam Wai Projects, leaving a gift of lacquered coal with emblem. House welcomes Joy Thomas for GWF orchestration.

Contradiction: Increasing momentum of auxiliary and objectifying engagement schemes for anticipated outside summer help with a short ten weeks to HDP completion. (Wk. 4)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: New possibility for frozen shrimp and prawn processing, complete with guaranteed market will provide new industry. Inked trip to Tainan nets 25 items of children's clothing for Hai Ou store and \$1,000 NT cash. Hai Ou's first minipark is begun behind the temple. Faculty of Kaohsiung Teachers' College help enlist college students for a Service Corps at Hai Ou this summer. 50 preschoolers travel to Kaohsiung.

Internal: Two staff don plastic waders and join the young women of the village in the pond, harvesting sea weed. House visits a marine laboratory and government demonstration of a shrimp processing plant.

Contradiction: Combining the strictly practical with far-reaching vision to bring off the needed economic intensification. (Wk. 3)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: House launches Area Hong Kong Yellow Submarine Maneuver to color the Philippines yellow by June with war room board listing "yellow bullion" (funding/authorization), "yellow papers" (materials), "yellow birds" (staff), and "yellow fever" (set-up/implementation). The three-week 66 forum blitz is called Yellow Frenzy.

Internal: Five-day holiday for Philippine national elections allows House three-day quarter planning while hosting Brian Smith (Canada via Langub to Cano Negro), Sandra Blaik (Australia to Sudtonggan), Don and Janet Baker (New York via Murrin Bridge), Joy Thomas (Chicago) and Art Rowe (Hong Kong).

Contradiction: Tenaciously doing the nitty-gritty to accomplish the big picture. (Wk. 3)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Visit with Commissioner Robert C.T. Lee, Chairman of the Joint Commission on Rural Reconstruction, reveals an important friend of ICA's Human Development work.

Internal: Peter Hu prepares an eight-course Chinese feast for House Church in celebration of his daughter Ann Hu becoming Ann Huang.

Contradiction: Moving into effective summer planning through final decisions for Quarter IV maneuvers. (Wk. 4)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: All five purok meetings are conducted totally by purok leaders (three to five from each purok) who were trained the previous Friday night. Four health workers are sent out to Health Fair in Langub prepared to test stools for all of Barrio Langub. Four villagers begin two-month process of getting travel clearance to attend GRA/Hong Kong/Taiwan two-year celebrations. ELC field trip to beach crowds more adults than children in the jeeps.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP)**

Internal: House receives two Manila Emerging Generation as summer camp dynamic. Don and Janet Baker visit enroute from Murrin Bridge and bring gifts of meter stick and marking pens! House barbecue on fishpond edge marks five-day holiday celebrated here due to first elections since initiation of Martial Law.

Contradiction: Discerning key catalytic events in the midst of multiple possibilities. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO-LANGUB HDP**

External: 200 plus of 'palawa' a coconut frond are made and painted during beautification workday. Four Health caretakers arrived from Sudtonggan Human Development Project to help initiate the upcoming Health Fair of Langub. The Bagong Lipunan building of Langub school is under construction. A proposal for a Ford Fiera is submitted to Davao Motor Sales. During the commerce, new industry and agriculture farmers meeting the people of Langub decided to negotiate the beginning of charcoal and buri factories. Engr. Garcia, the city renewal secretary, renewed the commitment to drill a well.

Internal: House sends Judy to teach the GWF in Bacolod and attend the National YWCA conference there.

Contradiction: Using time to advantage and not chasing shaky possibilities. (Wk. 4)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Community Youth Forum team sets up four Forums for October. Over 19 authorization people are visited to recruit ITI. The Hong Kong Development team breaks loose Japanese organizations for major funding. Set-up is held by all teams for the Guardian Meeting, crowned by a great Japan Guardians meeting.

Internal: Teams fill the House with Tokyo Area Logistics and ITI teams, Hong Kong Development team, Global Youth Forum team from Chicago (Mark Jewel and Kim Rafos), Mr. Tonosaki and Mr. Hibino from Oyubari.

Contradiction: Holding the stance that there are no problems. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Village mayor recruits TMs at Jeju Island meeting of all mayors. Repair Shop opens for business with electric welder, metal lathe and drill press in full operation. Quarter battleplanning releases new excitement as steps become clear.

Internal: House sends out William Salmon family to Chicago and welcomes villager Lee Jung Rim as sojourner. House income and Project/TM authorization are increased as English conversation class begins with new Vice Governor of the Island.

Contradiction: Catalyzing villagers to be auxiliary dynamic in order to cover all fronts. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Task forces hold village leaders meeting in Kuh Du E Ri for consult set-up planning with the new village hall 80% completed, hold HRM in Seoul for 45 young people, visit religious orders seeking inkind office space in Seoul, receive development gift from Chartered Bank, mail 100 invitations to the Consult to companies in Seoul, and attend dinner given by Mrs. Lee Chul Kyung.

Internal: House sends out Kim Won Ho and four regional colleagues to the Academy in Chicago, sends out the William Salmon family to Chicago, welcomes Hong Kong Centrum representative and enjoys first ecclesiola of the quarter with new construct from Chicago on the first week of the quarter.

Contradiction: Operating effectively out of local laws and global principles. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House begins to probe local university ESS clubs to recruit for the coming Youth Forum team.

Internal: In the midst of teaching English staff finds time to search for new house in which to relocate.

Contradiction: Being on a train while laying the tracks, taking sharp corners alarmingly fast. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Area logistics team, fired by successes in "Hokkaido 40" Town Meeting maneuver, get intros and meetings with Jaycees, Chamber of Commerce and prefecture officials for Town Meetings in Okayama and Wakayama prefectures.

Internal: Ecclesiola reaffirms the effectiveness of indirection by setting the context that helps colleagues understand why ICA is doing Town Meeting and building a Guardian net.

Contradiction: Setting up the consensed timeline that wins all victories. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP**

External: Second Japanese Guardian's Consult is held in Tokyo with citizens of Oyubari attending. Mr. Hibino, owner of wood factory and auxiliary advisor and Mr. Mashito Tonosaki, university senior working with ICA during school vacation are sent to Nam Wai HDP in Hong Kong for a week. Week II intensive gridding of Stake 4 Chitose (meaning a 1,000 years) begins preparation for actuation of six-week stake meeting model.

Internal: Celebration of Fast and the ecclesiola the same night causes reflection on being global people in a local situation is what profound humanness calls forth. Pamela Bergdall is sent to Kuh Du E Ri Consult enablement for three weeks. Bob Hanson and Molly Shaw go to Korean Consult as part of Area team.

Contradiction: Releasing creativity in a swirl of community visits in order to discern where the community is already moving. (Wk. 3)

## SYDNEY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Australia's "Women's Weekly," a magazine with circulation of five million, carries article endorsing Australian GWF trek of Quarter 3. New quarter begins with troops meeting across the Area to tie down plans for coming weeks.

Internal: The hunt for a new Sydney House intensifies.

Contradiction: Meshing the opening of new doors with consolidation of what has already been released in the previous wins of this year. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

Internal: House sends Sue Chapman out to HDTS faculty.

Contradiction: Creating forms that ensure growth on all fronts as campaign momentum becomes overwhelming. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN**

External: Key people visit for Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as areal demands shift. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Press reporters arrive in Oombulgurri just in time for breakfast with the community in the community kitchen. They hold a nationally viewed press conference with the Aboriginals to hear what they really have to say about mining on their land. Contradiction: Finding that the success of the guilds rests on the auxiliary rather than the guild core. (Wk. 3)

External: Twenty tables and materials in-kind and put together by regional and House troops are shipped off to Oombulgurri for the HDTS. Development stands at \$450 in-hand and \$600 committed. Oombulgurri Youth Trek for May school holidays forges ahead with babysitting fee adding to funds raised and a meeting with the School's Commission, which is most impressed with what has been accomplished thus far.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: House previews Murrin Bridge Consult document presented to Templestowe Apex Club who sent two club members to Murrin Bridge Consult. HDTS chairs are dispatched via inkind freight from major transport company. Consistent supporter, the Australian Buying Advisory Service, makes contribution of \$250.

Internal: Office and tribal resettlement and quarter's evaluation refit troops for Quarter IV before Week Three is over!

Contradiction: Building long-range missional strategies. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS**

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: The Meme Rich Committee of Asbury Methodist Church unanimously votes the Village Adoption proposal for

\$5,000 and offers many prospective consultants for the Charlottesville HDP.

Internal: Carriage House cleaning miracle encompasses unexpected troops of neighborhood children, thus allowing for two gardens to be made ready as well.

Contradiction: Articulating the priorities while counting down the quarter. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: County completion maneuver is finished with last TMs in Virginia, celebrated at Yorktown where the colonies won independence. Circuiters are sent out to Houses.

Internal: Three collegiums on articulating learning of the past six months pushes all to see the significance of the thrust as an area.

Contradiction: Building on the momentum of TM victories that will quickly launch county saturation and HDP Consults of Quarter IV. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP**

External: Three fund raising events in two days and a week-long beautification push (thanks to the presence of 12 additional troops here for a week) signal the momentum that has begun building up in the community as well as in the District.

Internal: Hosting two youth groups and the new auxiliaries for the New York Projects allows us to stand present to the impact of rehearsing all the contexts and principles that we live out of.

Contradiction: Dealing corporately and methodologically with glitches using all available troops. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE**

External: Nearly 10% of Widen turns up for the Town Meeting. When the HDP is mentioned in the plenary, they ask to "have one of those."

Internal: The House is impacted by the four evenings of history, the television series "Holocaust," and people talking about it in offices and elevators.

Contradiction: Building the structures and discipline that make sure you secure the wins God gives as you go. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Eight communities are targeted for saturation in Atlantic County, New Jersey. In addition, \$300 is received from Pennsylvania Bell Company for March Community Youth Forum.

Internal: House is impacted by the excitement of local Philadelphia colleagues as they respond to the call of area and global HDPs during metro briefing meeting.

Contradiction: Financial commitments to match the decisions and desire to participate both in upcoming consults and in county saturation. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Newsletter goes out and first \$400 check comes in for HDP Consultant fee.

Internal: Public awareness of our work catches us by surprise, like the first signs of spring, as five people independently walk in off the street to inquire about the ICA.

Contradiction: Objectifying visible signs of victory that will indicate the focus of Quarter IV. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN**

External: The arrival of the first \$400 consultant fee, one of several across the area, empowers push to request this week

at least down payment from those seriously interested. A TM with the leadership of Starks, Maine raises the possibility of that town deciding to have an exciting future rather than no future at all.

Internal: On successive collegiums, guardian report on Consult at Murrin Bridge and HDP site visits elsewhere in SEAPAC sets stage for brooding through the global context and symbolic function of HDPs.

Contradiction: Objectifying visible signs of victory that indicate focus of Quarter IV. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: New England field launches county saturation in Windham Co., CT, with Week II planning and visitation. House does HDP slide presentations in Gardner, Massachusetts; Greenfield, Massachusetts, and Hinesburg, Vermont and sends mailing to 100 consultation possibilities who will not be touched by slide presentation.

Internal: House celebrates the Evans' return by seeing a Boston Red Sox baseball game, then celebrates with the field with dinner out after visiting Windham County and celebrates Martha's birthday on April 23.

Contradiction: Keeping the details from falling through the cracks after making the overall plan. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: Forty-five residents of all ages participate in Charlotteville TM and participate in forming community consensus on the Project. Seventeen people come to first follow-up meeting and enthusiastically plan "Fix-up, Clean-up, Eat-up" event. Support from upstate New York floods in as Rochester United Methodist Church votes \$5,000, John Knox gives \$1,000 and other miscellaneous gifts come in. Saratoga Sweepstakes (county saturation) is off and running with first TM date set and five more targeted with referrals and GSF training in phone set-up.

Internal: Saturday night celebration with metro colleagues creates decor and materials for Charlotteville TM and county impact/saturation. Leah Early catalyzes great Development week with gifts from \$1,000 to \$9 gift from three metro Phase I.

Contradiction: Transferring general's cap for impact/saturation events to metro leadership without losing momentum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Initial TM held in Maine project site reveals hope and vision of the 15 townspeople present. Campaign Night is held with Boston GSF and field representatives from Hartford, resulting in field maneuvers written.

Internal: New holding charts and decor clarify the possibility of doing a quarter's worth of work in seven weeks. Breakloose of humor and a new sense of corporateness emerge with the new quarter.

Contradiction: Moving on all fronts while needing to prepare materials for all four major task arenas. (Wk. 2)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: One-third of the CFC's in Ontario are done, with 21 to do this week. Imaginal Education Course and slide show on the island open new possibilities in the saturation strategy. Proposal for 65 special issue school forums reveal our ability to change a structure.

Internal: Ecclesiola is key again this week and House never knows whether to set for four or 20. Twelve Lorne residents come and go as three return from Wales, and others are on

Development. Development PSU with global and area presence is awefilled. A listing of accounts payable provides objectivity.

Contradiction: Using methods that make generals of corporateness, not of specific areas. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of House is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Development/authorization team arrives to push forward the Secretary of State grant and reports on support and respect shown for ICA work across Canada. Community Forum Ontario tests set-up model with first CFC's.

Internal: Sodality does corporate research on purchase of new car.

Contradiction: Holding all the parts together so that everything moves with greater power.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Three hundred people celebrate Lorne's Greatest Year at the LHDP 1st Annual Assembly as program reports are given by local leadership, preschoolers sing and everyone is served cake and ice cream by the Brownies.

Internal: Auxiliary celebration with local leadership in fine restaurant following assembly gives opportunity to reflect on the year and to decide to deal with the present contradictions as two auxiliary and two from Lorne decide to leave the next morning for a week of Development.

Contradiction: Creating the vehicle through which leadership can emerge. (Wk. 4)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Long-awaited week of CHA, Cano Negro Hacia Adelante, arrives including scavenger hunt, parades, Community Assembly, workdays and Health Agricultural Fair in which seven agencies participate. Inkind nets new Gestetner, refrigerator, 500 reams of paper, kitchen supplies and whole cow for HDTs. Faculty works on HDTs adaption. Foro Comunitario in Maracaibo for Rotary youth is a great success.

Internal: Staff sends out Paul Calhoun to the Academy and celebrates with village the ending of the week of CHA.

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTs and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)
