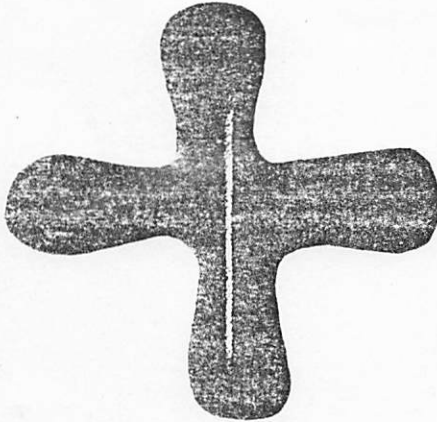

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: All but two targeted counties have Town Meetings set up or held, including one in the birthplace of the Duke of Wellington; Isle of Dogs Community Enterprise Society Ltd. meeting forges out viable models for small business complex, including mobile hot donut delivery service to island industries.

Internal: Thirty German youth spend three days in Bridge House enroute from Tai'rgwaith; Isle of Dogs Community Enterprise Society Small Business Manager astounds Auxiliary with delicious Indonesian meal and tales of his youth in Indonesia during political upheavals.

Contradiction: Harnessing the expertise which enables us to proceed with confidence. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Area Teams cover region by train and car, putting two more stronghold families in place to enable fall acceleration, holding one TM in Corrie Common and setting one up for next week; Development writes foundation proposal for Tai'rgwaith community store and brings back pledges from metro circuit visits..

Internal: House journeys to London for Area strategy, then to Tai'rgwaith for Cunningham-Dempster congregational dinner; House shares United Kingdom miracle stories and GRA Opening Address with key Glasgow colleagues over candlelight dinner.

Contradiction: Learning to manipulate the short sword of immediate TMs and the long sword of network catalyzation for next phase. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Workingmen's Club decides to purchase portable building for a commercial center to house a grocery store, garden center, general store items and small crafts industry, providing 5-15 new jobs; Tai'rgwaith and German youth have great day painting church, building adventure playground, followed by a football game and dance.

*You shall not pervert justice, either by favouring the poor or by subservience to the great. You shall judge your fellow-countryman with strict justice. Internal: House experiences fine evening, beginning with Cunningham-Dempster Congregational Dinner, capped with conversation on Project and Town Meeting Campaign accomplishments.

Contradiction: Putting decision of community into visible economic venture while all are on a holiday. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meetings are held in Lancashire and North Yorkshire, with one set up for Staffordshire, while group of clergymen in Gateshead consider Town Meeting format in September.

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Duncan comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diann Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is gold. The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for June 30 with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP)**

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terinese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakenment flurry. (Wk. 1)

**LAGOS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP**

External: ITI team sent out to Jos, while Inkind maneuvers in Lagos reap paper and food stuffs for ITI; Industry Local Management Committee meeting creates corporate community decisions of industry operations; Ijede Children's Club is officially registered with Ministry of Social Development, reactivating program for pre-schoolers; corporate Guild Meeting shifts Guilds' images toward total community responsibility..

Internal: Cleaning of store rooms reduces two to one.

Contradiction: Transforming the tension between order and urgency into creative winning. (Wk. 5)

**BRUSSELS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuric and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus.(Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US ) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Quarter III Dorpsdag (GCF) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: House attends graduation party of medical student colleague, where he and parents disclose plans to do extended stays in an HDP.

Internal: House sends out Martha Lapka to Global Priors Council, while continuing to host global colleagues passing through.

Contradiction: Being present to the next day's and week's opportunities for colleague engagement and maneuver groundwork over a summer of great dispersal. (Wk. 4)

**FRANKFURT**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: House participates in Kreuzberg Ost yearly evaluation and planning and is extremely impressed by the participation and enthusiasm of the Kreuzbergers and their astute picture of what has been accomplished in these two years.

Internal: After months of being on the road, an updated mailing list and straightened out office are fantastic accomplishments of one adult and two Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum while juggling practical tasks involved in running House alone. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP**

External: Full-time activity preparing for street festival nets over 3,000 DM worth of in-kind, newspaper coverage, operation of sausage, cake, drinks, finger paint and game stands; topped by Guild hosting a Turkish birthday celebration.

Internal: Korean colleague, Park Se Yo, arrives for street festival, bringing added international awareness for both House and community.

Contradiction: Taking time to take a breath and get hold of shifts going on without missing a beat. (Wk. 5)

**KINSHASA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP**

Five hundred attend grand celebration to welcome home Mr. Lengalenga from Kawangware and Kamweleni HDP visits, view HDP slide show and send out Farrars to Chicago. Visitors from Standard Bank and Northland Engineering express surprise at all that's going on in Kapini. Two trucks arrive on site with maize mill shed materials from Colgate-Palmolive as foundation is being laid. Site is cleared for block factory transfer and roofing is going on the 16-room training centre. Kapini hosts Commonwealth Community Developers from 14 Nations who join in Friday workday activities and singing at guild lunch. Ten farm trainees are now wearing green uniforms and receiving daily training. Government landrover arrives by surprise during Housechurch to collect mid-wives for their second week long training session in Kabwe. Kapini Green Warriors demonstrate style of winmanship against the Ngwerere Police in 1-1 tie.

Internal: Auxiliary staff welcomes Sukumar, from University of Zambia and Sri Lanka, who has come to help with roads and bridge rebuilding.

Contradiction: With auxiliary troops scattered in all directions, meeting dead lines for two major events.(Wk. 4)

**CAIRO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Marathon workday (6 am—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

**NAIROBI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: Bulk buying takes off in Kawangware with enthusiastic participation by community businessmen and East Africa Industries; visit from USAIDNGO evaluation team finds Kawangware rates high in involvement and dedication, low in statistical and financial aptitude; visit by Price Waterhouse, auditors, gives advice on proper setting of books; area post moves Volvo office as Development maneuver.

Internal: Mr. Lenga Lenga does collegium on the Kapini HDP, impacting the House with the fact that all programs are being done by volunteers who receive no bursaries.

Contradiction: Bridging the Order training gap in the arena of financial management. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP**

External: Community decides on continuous workdays to meet Canadian building timeline; cement donated by local shop owners and Chief's Baraza.

Internal: Mr. Lenga Lenga from Kapini visits; Augustine Hajega completes travel preparations for Global Council.

Contradiction: Finding the way to dramatize the appropriate urgency. (Wk. 4)

**BOMBAY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25*. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the Human Development Training School and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Reflection and battleplanning workshop focuses on role of House next year; Vinod Parekh and John Patterson meet Professor Raj Krishna, Chief of Planning Commission, who advises to develop crocodile skin and keep going.

Internal: Sufi story conversation gives new perspective on spirit dimension.

Contradiction: Continuing to carry on in the midst of ambiguity and uncertainty. (Wk. 5)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Rope making machine ordered and first wool muffler is produced. Baby weighing highlights Health Guild Week, 1056 feet of new road completed, 18 new bullock loans sanctioned, 10,500 cubic feet of morem is used to fill old village composte pits, eye camp examines 50 people, and application filed for electrification of Stake 1. Foundation dug for Women's Activity Center and hybrid jowar seeds distributed, with 10% of product to go to the mid-day meals program.

Internal: Jack Gilles returns with mountain of information from Maliwada, regarding the great campaign of the 25. All auxiliary move in to new House and celebrate with fine meal. Send out Balms, Dyhrs, Jack Gilles and Lance Ternasky to Project Directors' Meeting in Maliwada, with Dyhrs and Gilles to continue on to Europe.

Contradiction: Understanding project actuation in midst of radical staff turnover and keeping emerging monsoon from dictating models. (Wk. 2)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Income analysis indicates a 10% increase in community income in one month from new pandan material industry; 101 trees planted, lining village entrance and main road.

Internal: House sends Julie Hays to Kuala Lumpur to prepare Canadian Embassy proposal and Development push.

Contradiction: Insuring a shadow with each staff member for public and private sector appointments and all tasks in community. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI**

External: Economic Advisors to Prime Minister visit Project and reveal that Sungai Lui is one of four "pioneering" development projects in Malaysia under observation and evaluation for their contribution to the future direction of development policies in the nation.

Internal: Two new Malaysian interns join the Sungai Lui auxiliary.

Contradiction: Moving from the assembly area to the front lines as one force. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: MCK Stake 1 and pumps almost finished; new vegetables are planted in the garden; materials for new chicken house are prepared; guests are welcomed from Singer and village celebrates wedding.

Internal: House welcomes Kathleen Rees from Australia and two guests from Singapore, and sends out Scott to Medan.

Contradiction: How to keep leadership and programs going in the midst of many celebrations. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN)**

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

**HONG KONG**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: House joins with Nam Wai auxiliary in *Open Day* celebration; *One Day Wonder* Development in Hong Kong nets \$2000 (US).

Internal: Oberg returns from Tokyo trek; Nexus hosts Joanne Slicker enroute from Maliwada to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Maintaining finger on pulse of activity in zone in midst of pulling together year-end reports. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Four young adults sent out to Sudtonggan for Completion celebration, one sponsored by his company Duty Free Shoppers to the tune of HK\$1200, and 35 key villagers are present for send out and celebration planning with all ages and phases represented. Meeting and sendout established commitment for our own celebration July 2, 1978.

Internal: The House shifts into second phase of the quarter with a trip to local Chinese restaurant which renews vitality in preparation of rest of quarter. Student volunteer comes back to work in project 3 days a week after the completion of her school intern commitment.

Contradiction: Speeding up the tortoise pace of private and public in relation to the pace of competition. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Newly initiated 4H Club will not be blocked and finds new location to prepare for pig raising project. Village beautification has caught on and villagers now bring new plants for all the planters and assist in the planting and care.

Internal: Weekly collegium of Chinese lessons enables more spontaneous relations with the village.

Contradiction: Learning patience while the village follows through on the tasks constantly slowed down by red tape. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: S.C. Johnson donates \$3,000 and 5 other companies donate \$700. Inkind playground equipment from Goodyear and pre-school uniform material from Ramie Textiles is shipped free to Davao for the Langub HDP.

Internal: Dr. Roger Williams from Canberra visits on way back from Surusup consult and decides to visit Sudtonggan. Faithful remnant of three engage in house management and self-support with 10 new English students, bringing projected income to \$1,000 per month.

Contradiction: Holding the symbolic life of the Order when self-support necessitates 2 people leaving the house at 6:45 A.M. and returning at 9:00 P.M. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Published models for Hai Ou villagers' Philippine trip, including budget and task/itinerary chart; four people from Taiwan planning to attend Hokkaido ITI.

Internal: Metro colleagues join House in celebrating USA Independence Day; Joanne Slicker reports on India.

Contradiction: Locating new facility for the House which holds the relevant values. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGANN HDP**

External: Rock and craft orders surge to an all-time high; village painting sees 20 houses painted brilliant colors, with the 130 remaining houses to be finished soon; guild meeting

draws largest turnout ever with 180 people (20% of population).

Internal: Fourth of July, Filipino-US Friendship Day and Sandra Blaik's birthday are celebrated on a Virgin Island in the Cebu Channel; water pump motor now runs like a Rolls-Royce thanks to a skillfully overhaul by Lester and Andy.

Contradiction: Overcoming the illusion of "no contradiction" in this paradise. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Goodyear delivers tires and plywood, and sewing industry delivers first sample to buyer and receives order.

Internal: House welcomes Jay, Sandra and Andy from Sudtonggan HDP with a celebration around two bonfires.

Contradiction: Maintaining effective engagement. (Wk. 5)

**TOKYO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Visit to OISCA (Japanese voluntary service group) reception with Japanese colleague yields several new contacts and a hot LENS prospect, while Development calling nets two cash gifts for Oyubari summer program.

Internal: House welcomes Telakau family enroute to Oyubari summer program, and sends out Hickey family to summer assignments.

Contradiction: Formulating and implementing battleplans with one permeator and two sojourners. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: House hits the stake Town Meeting at Ban VI as getting ready for next week; preschool materials are sent to Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Great victory of the week was getting the jeep repaired.

Contradiction: Getting consensus without blocking structure among villagers. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult document in Korean is given to printer, and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

Contradiction: Fighting five crucial battles on widely scattered terrain with one platoon. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House celebrates new apartment overlooking South Fukuoka with a barbeque, hosting twenty friends.

Internal: Preparation for the houseparty including getting up wall maps, grids and wedge blades to decor new House location.

Contradiction: Keeping on-going contacts in midst of moving. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Visit with head of women's groups in Kobe (100,000 members) sets up GWF for group leaders November 20th.

Internal: Joanne Slicker visits on way to States, bringing exciting stories from India, and inaugurates one more room in new 16-room, rent-free facility, as House sends to Order account \$8,261 deposit refund from previous facility and

settles in, with chaos enough under control to allow invitation to E.G. from other Japan Houses for summer program.

Contradiction: Determining the ways that internal victories release breaklooses in the external mission. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: Faculty recruited for Summer Program as plans pull together. Details worked out for 2 English Camps the last week in July will help finances for August. Joseph Iida arrives from Tokyo to work out practices for Rikkyo University Work Camp the end of August. Inkind shipment from Lion Soap Co. Town Meeting circuits and August maneuver gets planned.

Internal: A week of arrivals: Hiroshi Fukuyama arrives from Tokyo to be on ICA staff; Molly Shaw's parents from Oregon, the Prines arrive for a week's visit. Palamon and Voaita Talackan arrive from Majuro for Project visit and August program. Eija Karikoski departs for Tokyo then Finland for summer. Discontinuity during Week II takes families to other parts of Hokkaido.

Contradiction: Continuing the building of consensus in the community for the summer program. (Wk. 4)

**SYDNEY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Metro Guardians plan series of Murrin Bridge HDP task forces to attack visibility with a vengeance; in-kind miracles include outfitted dentist chair and cladding for industrial shed.

Internal: House creates urban market garden in own backyard; House sends out Oakley's to Prior's Council and receives Claire Chapman to sojourn.

Contradiction: Concentrating troop effort for effectivity, rather than maintaining services only. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Beginning of Phase 3 of State CMA Campaign sees five meetings held, three set up, a model for Home Community meetings as a breakloose for urban saturation, and proposals submitted totalling \$5,000.

Internal: House sends out Liza Tod and John Rader on South West Circuit and Kathleen Rees to Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Treating this quarter as the last one. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN**

External: Key people visit for Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on Area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as real demands shift. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: School and Community Kitchen begin again; school and home gardens are planted; week culminated with Saturday night sing-a-long celebration.

Internal: Collegium room is transformed with paint and new curtains; House enjoys nightly crab-meat feasts, and welcomes back Joanne Baker.

Contradiction: Establishing new structures which reflect the new decisions of the people with respect to the future. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Visit to HDTs grads in Point McLeay reveals deep excitement for beginning relationship to Murrin Bridge HDP.

Internal: House transforms lounge into Asian room, dines on giant mushrooms from Point McLeay and hosts German guest

for five days.

Contradiction: Launching the next Community Meeting maneuver while continuing Development momentum. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Caravan donated and moved to Murrin Bridge by the Elletts, regional guardians; two other guardian couples use social methods to plan their local council election campaign; \$50 check received made out to the ICA *Riotous Living Account*.

Internal: Three newly discovered entrepreneurs are hosted at dinner in preparation for the Murrin Bridge Economic Acceleration Trek.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the response of those who have structural relation to our theaters of engagement. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Serusup Consult finished and both Areas hold Councils: Sydney and Singapore for the quarter as key political contacts are made across a broad spectrum.

Internal: Host Development PSU and hear great reports as Garnet and Liz Banks return from Singapore and George Holcombe from HDTs.

Contradiction: Discerning the mood of the nation to create the next steps in authorization and development in order to engage new troops. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: Quarter planning combines Community Meeting method and maneuver building for exciting eight weeks to come; call on old patron reveals new names of Queensland business leaders for Development.

Internal: Anthony Betonte is sent out to teach in the Oombulgurri School; massive house cleaning reveals a washing machine in the back cupboard after current machine gives up the ghost, proving that *Mother Order's* cupboard is never bare; islander and aboriginal films add new dimension to House celebration.

Contradiction: Enacting the corporateness needed to get the task done. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

Contradiction: Holding rites of passage in community maturity with a shift in auxiliary style. (Wk. 5)

Internal: Rose and Elaine Worden are welcomed to the Project; Rafael Davila, Steve and Lyn Brazen are sent out to Prior's Council, during the second half of the community celebration.

Contradiction: Deciding the future so that loss in program momentum doesn't show up as negative visibility. (Wk. 5)

**BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Guild meetings draw 114 to Community Center; pre-school set-up begins with teacher recruitment; Agriculture Guild sets up a community meeting with the General Manager of Food Service, a freezing-processing plant; two days of digging canals drain flooded roads; truck is in-kind from the Institute of Rural Education to be used one day a week for pick-ups in Santiago.

Internal: Office space is in-kind in Santiago; youth cluster begins afternoon study sessions.

Contradiction: Prioritizing while moving ahead simultaneously with all tasks. (Wk. 5)

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

## **HAVANA**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Human Development Project goes visible as 75 people turn out for a work day on Monday on the village square, brushing 500 feet of roadside banks, building retaining walls, flower beds and gigantic welcome sign, chopping and removing 16 fallen logs; lunch in-kind, prepared, and served to all; first copies of Consult Document roll off the JAMAL Press, resplendent in yellow covers with green and black printing (National Colors).

Internal: Troops abound, as Bingham return from family heritage trek, receive Anthony Braithwaite of Woburn Lawn as new auxiliary; Teresa is sent out to the GRA; lumber arrives to build collegium tables, while Kingston House Maneuver creates space, time and forces designs for expended living.

Contradiction: Securing the materials and finances to do all the tactics while going ahead and launching programs on all fronts with what we have. (Wk. 4)

## **MEXICO CITY**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is transformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports that a HUD grant of \$270,000 for Delta Pace sewers and a \$2,000 Mobil Oil grant for Medan are approved. Authorization documents produced by the GRA and the India Replication brochure are printed for Order Council. Official approval was given for Development activity in Indonesia. Key Canadian family gives \$5,000 from company and invites \$25,000 proposal to foundation. American Farm Bureau and insurance company networks are anxious to web HDPs into their services, bulletins and personnel. The key contradiction lies in the arena of giving contextual frame and corporate form to breaklooses at the local level and weaving these together into grand maneuvers that catapult Development into the next orbit.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports that Global Priors Council in Chicago continues the task of reflection on the insights and learnings of the past year. Council names the victories in Global Social Demonstration and Global Community Forum. Hong Kong reports that "doing it" is the key to breaking the image of "it can't be done here." The contradiction is in the arena of allowing front line data to be seen as "victories" and becoming part of the global momentum for the year ahead.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports that Brussels is sending continental troops to the United Kingdom counties campaign, filling out its three-ring circus for next month. A tracking map of the UK Campaign is prepared as a symbol and monitoring tool. Hong Kong reports that young adults from a permeator's English class participate in Nam Wai workdays and "Open Day" celebration. Breakthroughs occur in the arena of acting out of the stance that every human being is a potential troop, with invitation and engagement the key to actuating that potential. The contradiction is in the arena of relating the edge of the New Reality to everyday tasks involving Operations.

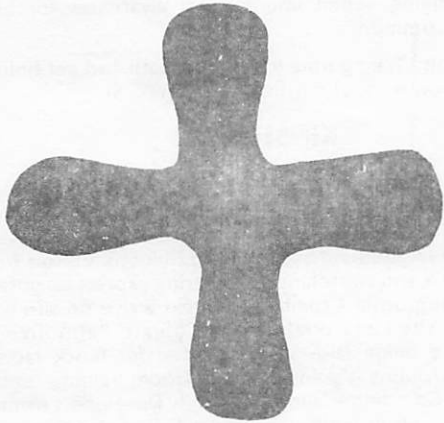
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum reports that Brussels celebrates the release of 550,000 BF (\$17,000) in matching funds for use for Maharashtra. A fourth India visa is secured to return American staff to India. Hong Kong creates cash voucher forms that serve both as a check request form and a specific individual logging of expenditures by the recipient receiving the check. Petty cash back up receipts for Hong Kong ICA books are organized for the first time in six months. The contradiction is in the arena of maintaining cash flow and all management systems until the return of troops from the summer program.

Internal: Thirty German youth spend three days in Bridge House enroute from Tai'rgwaith; Isle of Dogs Community Enterprise Society Small Business Manager astounds Auxiliary with delicious Indonesian meal and tales of his youth in Indonesia during political upheavals.

Contradiction: Harnessing the expertise which enables us to proceed with confidence. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Area Teams cover region by train and car, putting two more stronghold families in place to enable fall acceleration, holding one TM in Corrie Common and setting one up for next week; Development writes foundation proposal for Tai'rgwaith community store and brings back pledges from metro circuit visits.

Internal: House journeys to London for Area strategy, then to Tai'rgwaith for Cunningham-Dempster congregational dinner; House shares United Kingdom miracle stories and GRA Opening Address with key Glasgow colleagues over candlelight dinner.

Contradiction: Learning to manipulate the short sword of immediate TMs and the long sword of network catalyzation for next phase. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Workingmen's Club decides to purchase portable building for a commercial center to house a grocery store, garden center, general store items and small crafts industry, providing 5-15 new jobs; Tai'rgwaith and German youth have great day painting church, building adventure playground, followed by a football game and dance.

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Duncan comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diann Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is gold. The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for June 30 with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

### **(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP)**

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terinese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakenment flurry. (Wk. 1)

## **LAGOS**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP**

External: ITI team sent out to Jos, while Inkind maneuvers in Lagos reap paper and food stuffs for ITI; Industry Local Management Committee meeting creates corporate community decisions of industry operations; Ijede Children's Club is officially registered with Ministry of Social Development, reactivating program for pre-schoolers; corporate Guild Meeting shifts Guilds' images toward total community responsibility..

Internal: Cleaning of store rooms reduces two to one.

Contradiction: Transforming the tension between order and urgency into creative winning. (Wk. 5)

## **BRUSSELS**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuric and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus.(Wk. 3)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US ) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Quarter III Dorpsdag (GCF) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: House attends graduation party of medical student colleague, where he and parents disclose plans to do extended stays in an HDP.

Internal: House sends out Martha Lapka to Global Priors Council, while continuing to host global colleagues passing through.

Contradiction: Being present to the next day's and week's opportunities for colleague engagement and maneuver groundwork over a summer of great dispersal. (Wk. 4)

## **FRANKFURT**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: House participates in Kreuzberg Ost yearly evaluation and planning and is extremely impressed by the participation and enthusiasm of the Kreuzbergers and their astute picture of what has been accomplished in these two years.

Internal: After months of being on the road, an updated mailing list and straightened out office are fantastic accomplishments of one adult and two Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum while juggling practical tasks,involved in running House alone. (Wk. 1)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP**

External: Full-time activity preparing for street festival nets over 3,000 DM worth of in-kind, newspaper coverage, operation of sausage, cake, drinks, finger paint and game stands; topped by Guild hosting a Turkish birthday celebration.

Internal: Korean colleague, Park Se Yo, arrives for street festival, bringing added international awareness for both House and community.

Contradiction: Taking time to take a breath and get hold of shifts going on without missing a beat. (Wk. 5)

## **KINSHASA**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP**

Five hundred attend grand celebration to welcome home Mr. Lengalenga from Kawangware and Kamweleni HDP visits, view HDP slide show and send out Farrars to Chicago. Visitors from Standard Bank and Northland Engineering express surprise at all that's going on in Kapini. Two trucks arrive on site with maize mill shed materials from Colgate-Palmolive as foundation is being laid. Site is cleared for block factory transfer and roofing is going on the 16-room training centre. Kapini hosts Commonwealth Community Developers from 14 Nations who join in Friday workday activities and singing at guild lunch. Ten farm trainees are now wearing green uniforms and receiving daily training. Government landrover arrives by surprise during Housechurch to collect mid-wives for their second week long training session in Kabwe. Kapini Green Warriors demonstrate style of winmanship against the Ngwerere Police in 1-1 tie.

Internal: Auxiliary staff welcomes Sukumar, from University of Zambia and Sri Lanka, who has come to help with roads and bridge rebuilding.

Contradiction: With auxiliary troops scattered in all directions, meeting dead lines for two major events.(Wk. 4)

## **CAIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Marathon workday (6 am—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

## **NAIROBI**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: FARMTECH provides tractor to plough new cooperative farm. World Neighbors sends \$3500 for next phase of agricultural apprenticeship program. Kawangware Business Association elects sub-management committee for the shop owners in order to deal with the wholesale business. The construction industry is building a house for Mr. Motiga, a colleague in the Vice President's office, on contract. Eleven companies participate in the production of the Kamweleni document, totally inkinded.

Contradiction: Continuing to carry on in the midst of ambiguity and uncertainty. (Wk. 5)

**MADRAS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Rope making machine ordered and first wool muffer is produced. Baby weighing highlights Health Guild Week, 1056 feet of new road completed, 18 new bullock loans sanctioned, 10,500 cubic feet of morem is used to fill old village composte pits, eye camp examines 50 people, and application filed for electrification of Stake 1. Foundation dug for Women's Activity Center and hybrid jowar seeds distributed, with 10% of product to go to the mid-day meals program.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

**SINGAPORE**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

Internal: Scott returns from Development trip to Medan and House receives two sojourners from University of Indonesia.

Contradiction: Creating with the village a vision of the future and a plan of present action. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in

Contradiction: Maintaining volunteer momentum catalyzed by Town Meeting saturation. (Wk. 4)

**NEW YORK**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: House and metro colleagues finish first edition of community newsletter.

Internal: House holds workday with regional colleagues, painting and washing windows, releasing new spirit.

Contradiction: Deciding priorities without comprehensive context. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Metro participates in the dynamic of GRA: reports and research.

Internal: Area data gathering reminds us of care and accountability.

Contradiction: Articulating activity of programs as profound humanness so that formulated region sees itself filling all GSF roles. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Campaign News and HDP Update mailing goes out to metro colleagues, announcing victories.

Internal: Inkind groceries are assured as Manager of Tops grocery chain agrees to donate on a weekly basis.

Contradiction: Delivering people from the "family-job" syndrome. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Weekly "Campaign Night" continues to re-engage colleagues, and enable effective reflection on vocation and the new year's missional priorities.

Internal: House celebrates the week and the new quarter by seeing a movie Saturday night.

Contradiction: Planning for the fall while facing pre-Council ambiguity. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Decision to expand advocacy base in the community by revisiting community families results in 17 visits with local guides along and several small gatherings, including a showing of the movie *National Velvet*.

Internal: Thorough house cleaning symbolizes re-decision to stand as a sign to the community.

Contradiction: Using relevant methods to give practical form to the vision that will motivate corporate volunteer action. (Wk. 6)

**CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Cano Negro celebrates the return of seven Cano Negro consultants from the other four Latin American Projects; wild ecstasy and gratitude are demonstrated in a grand parade, followed by toasts.

Internal: Rose and Elaine Worden are welcomed to the Project; Rafael Davila, Steve and Lyn Brazen are sent out to Prior's Council, during the second half of the community celebration.

Contradiction: Deciding the future so that loss in program momentum doesn't show up as negative visibility. (Wk. 5)

**BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Agriculture Guild meets with 45 farmers to discuss plan for crop planting and negotiate prices with a buyer-exporter who has taken interest in the project. Commercial moves ahead on plans and contacts for Angora rabbits, crafts, and financial analysis. Pre-school opening impacts village with bright yellow uniforms.

Internal: Key leadership are invited in for Common Meal and maneuver planning.

Contradiction: Getting necessary clarity on intensification maneuvers for Expansion Phase. (Wk. 6)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; pre-school with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Human Development Project goes visible as 75 people turn out for a work day on Monday on the village square, brushing 500 feet of roadside banks, building retaining walls, flower beds and gigantic welcome sign, chopping and removing 16 fallen logs; lunch in-kind, prepared, and served to all; first copies of Consult Document roll off the JAMAL Press, resplendent in yellow covers with green and black printing (National Colors).

Internal: Troops abound, as Bingham return from family heritage trek, receive Anthony Braithwaite of Woburn Lawn as new auxiliary; Teresa is sent out to the GRA; lumber arrives to build collegium tables, while Kingston House Maneuver creates space, time and forces designs for expended living.

Contradiction: Securing the materials and finances to do all the tactics while going ahead and launching programs on all fronts with what we have. (Wk. 4)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is transformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports that a HUD grant of \$270,000 for Delta Pace sewers and a \$2,000 Mobil Oil grant for Medan are approved. Authorization documents produced by the GRA and the India Replication brochure are printed for Order Council. Official approval was given for Development activity in Indonesia. Key Canadian family gives \$5,000 from company and invites \$25,000 proposal to foundation. American Farm Bureau and insurance company networks are anxious to web HDPs into their services, bulletins and personnel. The key contradiction lies in the arena of giving contextual frame and corporate form to breaklooses at the local level and weaving these together into grand maneuvers that catapult Development into the next orbit.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports that Global Priors Council in Chicago continues the task of reflection on the insights and learnings of the past year. Council names the victories in Global Social Demonstration and Global Community Forum. Hong Kong reports that "doing it" is the key to breaking the image of "it can't be done here." The contradiction is in the arena of allowing front line data to be seen as "victories" and becoming part of the global momentum for the year ahead.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports that Brussels is sending continental troops to the United Kingdom counties campaign, filling out its three-ring circus for next month. A tracking map of the UK Campaign is prepared as a symbol and monitoring tool. Hong Kong reports that young adults from a permeator's English class participate in Nam Wai workdays and "Open Day" celebration. Breakthroughs occur in the arena of acting out of the stance that every human being is a potential troop, with invitation and engagement the key to actuating that potential. The contradiction is in the arena of relating the edge of the New Reality to everyday tasks involving Operations.

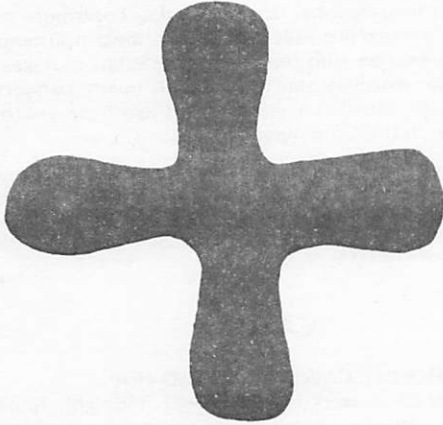
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum reports that Brussels celebrates the release of 550,000 BF (\$17,000) in matching funds for use for Maharashtra. A fourth India visa is secured to return American staff to India. Hong Kong creates cash voucher forms that serve both as a check request form and a specific individual logging of expenditures by the recipient receiving the check. Petty cash back up receipts for Hong Kong ICA books are organized for the first time in six months. The contradiction is in the arena of maintaining cash flow and all management systems until the return of troops from the summer program.

Internal: Wayside Inn spinning with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use Ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: The "be-ment" of the Region is catalyzed through the global miracle stories and reports to colleagues.

Internal: GRA charts and spins illuminate that we are all at the same place, wherever we are, with the same joys and struggles.

Contradiction: Dancing in the tension between catalyzing and just doing. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: British Broadcasting Company (BBC2 Wales) spends all day filming in preparation of a nation-wide Welsh program. NCB paints the washery (National Coal Board) and promises to landscape the land which is the entrance to the village. Local company donates blocks for new community company building.

Internal: The Farley family of the Intermediate Technology Group, who offers expertise in building construction visits the Project.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum to finish three month maneuver plan. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meetings are held in Lancashire and North

Yorkshire, with one set up for Staffordshire, while group of clergymen in Gateshead consider Town Meeting format in September.

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diann Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is gold. The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for June 30 with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terinese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakening flurry. (Wk. 1)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Ijede Children's Club opens, reinstating Children's Institute Program, with 120 three, four and five year olds. Teachers end first week with celebration and curriculum planning. Two in-kind IBM selectric typewriters are delivered, and \$6200 (USD) worth of food and materials for the ITI are received.

Internal: Collegium on "Touchstones of Auxiliary Priorship" raises consciousness on practical ways of exercising corporateness.

Contradiction: Keeping critical equipment repaired and maintained in order to spend less time doing repairs. (Wk. 7)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the future and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Quarter III Dorpsdag (GCF) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House attends graduation party of medical student colleague, where he and parents disclose plans to do extended stays in an HDP.

Internal: House sends out Martha Lapka to Global Priors Council, while continuing to host global colleagues passing through.

Contradiction: Being present to the next day's and week's opportunities for colleague engagement and maneuver groundwork over a summer of great dispersal. (Wk. 4)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: House participates in Kreuzberg Ost yearly evaluation and planning and is extremely impressed by the participation and enthusiasm of the Kreuzbergers and their astute picture of what has been accomplished in these two years.

Internal: After months of being on the road, an updated mailing list and straightened out office are fantastic accomplishments of one adult and two Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum while juggling practical tasks involved in running House alone. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Full-time activity preparing for street festival nets over 3,000 DM worth of in-kind, newspaper coverage, operation of sausage, cake, drinks, finger paint and game stands; topped by Guild hosting a Turkish birthday celebration.

Internal: Korean colleague, Park Se Yo, arrives for street festival, bringing added international awareness for both House and community.

Contradiction: Taking time to take a breath and get hold of shifts going on without missing a beat. (Wk. 5)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Celebration impacts community as more than 400 villagers join in traditional dancing. Stakes contribute meal and money. Maize mill grinds three bags of meal in 30 minutes as part of celebration. Villagers experience eating in stakes for the first time. Auxiliary staff moves into nearly completed training center. Headmen encourage the village youth to seriously join in the Community Forum.

Internal: Thomas Masiye comes back from Shantumbu and joins the Farmers' Guild as a volunteer staff.

Contradiction: Going ahead with forces while researching the effective path. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 am—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: FARMTECH provides tractor to plough new cooperative farm. World Neighbors sends \$3500 for next phase of agricultural apprenticeship program. Kawangware Business Association elects sub-management committee for the shop owners in order to deal with the wholesale business. The construction industry is building a house for Mr. Motiga, a colleague in the Vice President's office, on contract. Eleven companies participate in the production of the Kamweleni document, totally inked.

Internal: Seriousness of situation and missional task are brought home in hilarious session of testing knowledge of current maneuvers and Order principles and creating family budgets.

Contradiction: Speeding up the Co-op timeline so that industries function and are self-supporting. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: School committee finances petrol for car which did a month's work in carrying stone, enabling completion of 1-1/2 foundations. First Canadian building is erected, provided two classrooms and one office. National water expert investigates all possibilities. Health clinic brings worming tablets, and a social worker to begin a women's group. Councillor J. Wambua delivers cement and arranges to set up a series of Village Meetings.

Internal: House joins a week of work days and sends James Lembcke to United States.

Contradiction: Formalizing industrial management. (Wk. 7)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the Human Development Training School and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25*. (Wk. 13)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

Internal: House fasts and feasts, celebrating Sheahan Paul's birthday with a beautiful chocolate birthday cake. Marie Paul is sent out to Prior's Council, and Roger Butcher is sent out to Vaviharsh.

Contradiction: Catching the train with a flat tire five miles away from the rail station. (Wk. 7)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Rope making machine ordered and first wool muffler is produced. Baby weighing highlights Health Guild Week, 1056 feet of new road completed, 18 new bullock loans sanctioned, 10,500 cubic feet of morem is used to fill old village composte pits, eye camp examines 50 people, and application filed for electrification of Stake 1. Foundation dug for Women's Activity Center and hybrid jowar seeds distributed, with 10% of product to go to the mid-day meals program.

Internal: Jack Gilles returns with mountain of information from Maliwada, regarding the great campaign of the 25. All auxiliary move in to new House and celebrate with fine meal. Contradiction: Understanding project actuation in midst of radical staff turnover and keeping emerging monsoon from dictating models. (Wk. 2)

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Contradiction: Building the understanding of project finances among the village people to clarify ownership of village industries and facilities. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Getting assigned troops on location to begin consult preparation and local framing. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: House joins with Nam Wai auxiliary in *Open Day* celebration; *One Day Wonder* Development in Hong Kong nets \$2000 (US).

Internal: Oberg returns from Tokyo trek; Nexus hosts Joanne Slicker enroute from Maliwada to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Maintaining finger on pulse of activity in zone in midst of pulling together year-end reports. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Appointments, structures and summer program continue in the midst of tropical storm, Agnes. HDP Center comes alive with typing and guitar practice during stormy week.

Contradiction: Dancing over the financial problems. (Wk. 7)

**TOKYO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Three participants are recruited for summer program in Oyubari. Two hundred songbooks are printed inkind. Twenty-seven passenger buses begins the journey north to the program.

Internal: Bob Hansen arrives, attends Lutheran conference in Nagano Prefecture, and serves as liturgist for a great House Church.

Contradiction: Building up steam for the fall rather than letting the summer heat sap missional energy. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Materials for India are printed and summer work continues to be refined and published in the transition week after Council ends and before Discontinuity begins.

Internal: Collegiums reflect on the work of the summer, cleaning blitz puts the building in good order for August and task forces are set up to handle ongoing work during the period of discontinuity and resettlement.

Contradiction: Covering all bases during August. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Many Fifth City citizens attend GRA sessions, and GRA visits Fifth City; \$35,000 assured for Elders Action Center; model for summer use of recreation center created, with task force taking charge.

Internal: Headmistress of Woburn Lawn school spends weekend with Lela Mosley; House welcomes Helen Eskridge, Ed Miller and Lela Mosley back from Latin American Consults.

Contradiction: Maintaining a focused time design that will allow significant Council participation, while sustaining ongoing project momentum. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA**

External: Letters from towns in response to the question, "What happened after your town meeting?" report that newsletters, grant requests, cleanup days, more town meetings, joining the PRIDE (state community development program), and plans for a festival are in the works.

Internal: Office decor updated with document covers from each Kansas Town Meeting and six-color timeline.

Contradiction: Moving on while the summer program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: A week of coming and going as seven return from weekend at GRA; and visit to Fifth City; youth gather at 5:30 a.m. each morning to meet detasseling contract with Pioneer Seed Company; first guild meeting launches five guilds, while plans are created for stake float in Watermelon Day Parade at first stake meeting.

Internal: Visitors flood through, making global colleague-ship a reality, with impromptu Indian feast for community and House capping the week.

Contradiction: Creating leadership training models to turn willing helpers into confident leaders. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Metro colleagues travel to Lorimor for street dance celebration.

Internal: Twelve metro colleagues continue House Church, Ecclesiola and House renovation, while House members attend Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving beyond operating out of old regionalis images. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Promising presentation is made to the Rural and Development Council for funds for the Kinney HDP.

Internal: House welcomes new intern, Bob Johnson, and returning staff, Dorothy Roof, who then promptly depart for Chicago.

Contradiction: Changing unmotivating state of stability and comfort produced from completion of maneuvers for '77-'78. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Colleague in nearby town calls with news of his town's request for a series of Town Meetings.

Internal: Entire House in Chicago to participate in consensing on next year's directions at Priors Council.

Contradiction: Discerning advantages when Town Meeting documents are in three different Houses and evaluations are incomplete. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Twelve kids form Voice delivery team to kick off weekly program with four mile hike to the river.

Internal: Auxiliary house yard facelift and clearing of drainage ditch builds community confidence and recalls the importance of ICA space visibility.

Contradiction: Enabling a growing group to create and implement their own maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: Kinney Community Park is created with a fantastic workday involving 100 residents building playground equipment and a barbeque, painting a fence, and starting a tennis court and parking lot, closing with a barbeque and street dance. Thirty people spend all day Sunday on finishing touches, prompting another picnic. Blackboard is propped up against a tree for weekly maneuver planning.

Internal: Frenzied non-stop week of preparation for workday finds House and community relaxing together in local nodes in the evening, reflecting on the day.

Contradiction: Building the local polity and law enforcement dynamics which will ensure the safety of community projects. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDPs along the way.

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDPs right here at home. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: House receives letter from Hospital Heights in the City of New Castle, describing remarkable accomplishments since June 14 Town Meeting. Jeanne Wilson is sent to Michigan to prepare Department of Labor proposal for GWF across Michigan.

Internal: House paints new worship room, E.G. room and collegium room, celebrates two E.G. birthdays, sends out Ruth Landmann to new assignment and enjoys visit by Mary D'Souza.

Contradiction: Designing a model for self-support which provides flexible use of time and plenty of money. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Great Kentucky Cotillion is finished in grand style—all 120 counties are GOLDEN.

Internal: Cotillion celebration with colleagues, with sendout of Jim Armour to the Widen Consult and Shirley St. John to the Alabama Campaign.

Contradiction: Gathering all loose ends in order to focus on the summer. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Council participants meet to rehearse maneuver building methodology in preparation for Guild's Quarter I maneuver workshop. Town Meeting campaign receives check in mail from Sears, Detroit group, for \$300 and readies cars for circuits.

Internal: House completes necessary construction on in-kind facility and symbolizes the year's new game with in-kind seats at Lions' pre-season opening football game.

Contradiction: Naming the immediate victory that claims the new year for the entire region. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: The Cleveland Saturation Experiment continues beyond its goal with requests being called in and Town Meetings being held in more pivotal neighborhoods.

Internal: Celebration of return from Brazil Consult of Lois Reeves and Mike Tippett elicits two more HDP volunteer decisions.

Contradiction: Maintaining volunteer momentum catalyzed by Town Meeting saturation. (Wk. 4)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: New York House plays the role of the Wayside Inn in the hosting and sending forth of colleagues to Africa for the ITI in Lagos, Ijede HDP and the Termine HDP.

Internal: Collegiums on Africa and Italy inform House of the new vision for these nations in the coming year and the implications for the New York Area in 1978-79.

Contradiction: Living in August with October missional images. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Metro participates in the dynamic of GRA: reports and research.

Internal: Area data gathering reminds us of care and accountability.

Contradiction: Articulating activity of programs as profound humanness so that formulated region sees itself filling all GSF roles. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Campaign News and HDP Update mailing goes out to metro colleagues, announcing victories.

Internal: Inkind groceries are assured as Manager of Tops grocery chain agrees to donate on a weekly basis.

Contradiction: Delivering people from the "family-job" syndrome. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: The entire House participates in Prior's Council while new sojourner holds down the homefront.

Internal: House members return from Global Prior's Council and Phase I camp, and one permeator receives \$100 per week raise.

Contradiction: Communicating the excitement, enthusiasm and historical significance of the GCF campaign to regional colleagues. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON—IVY CITY HDP**

External: VISTA site visit with John Lewis, Director of ACTION, reminds the community once again of the many eyes that are on Ivy City as one of the global band, while the third annual fish fry is a great success with 108 pounds of in-kind fish.

Internal: Breakfast collegium outside on the porch is a refreshing reminder of the greatness of Ivy City, and renovation continues in the Annex building as kitchen floor is retiled, walls and shelves are painted, and ceiling is repaired.

Contradiction: Structuring on-going care of the highly visible signs in living environment, without losing momentum on any front. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: The community is raising money (\$700 for the Volunteer Fire Department, \$60 for the gym) by asking their friends and bosses, and holding bake sales and spaghetti dinners. Senior citizens meet to plan gala "Back to Widen Day" for June 30, 1979, to which all past residents will be invited.

Internal: First youth group arrives to work in Widen, catalyzes orderly basketball games, and is invited to live in residents' homes.

Contradiction: Creating a visible sign of readiness to encourage participating in the opening of the store. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Six-week Development task force ends its first phase of setting the stage with much in-kind ceramic tile, increasing list of donor prospects to contact, and 30 letters sent which will initiate the process of building networks for in-kind and for foundation proposals. Five-year-old grid from House archives is revitalized in preparation for fall campaign.

Internal: Activated Memorial 13 by adding third family to the House.

Contradiction: Mobilizing quickly colleagues in three metros relatively untouched in the last two years for Area Council participation. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: House hosts the whole Order, it seems, with the securing of passports and travel arrangements to move into 1978-79 assignments.

Internal: Northern New Jersey again sends new colleagues to Wednesday night maneuver-writing and the launch of the five-week countdown to Area Council.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK)**

Contradiction: Living in August with being bombarded with October missional images. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

Internal: The Higgins, Whitneys and Tolmans visit Starks, bringing global news.

Contradiction: Juggling time and forces to make scheduled events come off. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Weekly "Campaign Night" continues to re-engage colleagues, and enable effective reflection on vocation and the new year's missional priorities.

Internal: House celebrates the week and the new quarter by seeing a movie Saturday night.

Contradiction: Planning for the fall while facing pre-Council ambiguity. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Work day on Methodist property reclaims space for community, and ends with impromptu hymn sing, picnic and silent movies.

Internal: Workshops on framing and three-month project timeline push new depth of maneuver understanding.

Contradiction: Creating signs which expand motivation and boost courage of those outside the leadership core. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: House accomplishes goal of advance contacts for fall impact planning by mailing GWF, CYF and LENS promotionals, Community Network (newsletter), and an invitation to Starks HDP workday and Area Council.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Visits to three senators this week, including Senator Molson.

Internal: Rev. David Bugler comes to help put consultations task force on the road; closing celebration of year sends out youth to camp, farm and Chicago, leaving remnant to proceed with details of moving into summer program configurations.

Contradiction: Holding futuristic vision for House in midst of everything seeming to draw to a close. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Lornecraft Furniture Division debuts with first exhibition outside county. New Day Canada mailing completed and three teams cover New Brunswick.

Internal: Report of Hermel Lapointe and Muriel Chamberlain on GRA at Ecclesiola represents not only community, but also ICA.

Contradiction: Sustaining motivity and corporate work patterns in the face of continuing struggle to get on necessary deeds of summer. (Wk. 7)

**CARACAS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Youth summer program is launched and highlighted by a day-long pre-school outing to the zoo in Caracas.

Internal: Auxiliary entertains landscape architect who creates image of a flowering plaza, catalyzing enthusiasm for the plaza building.

Contradiction: Being trapped into sustaining the project rather than creating corporate, life-giving events. (Wk. 7)

**BUENOS AIRES**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Agriculture Guild meets with 45 farmers to discuss plan for crop planting and negotiate prices with a buyer-exporter who has taken interest in the project. Commercial moves ahead on plans and contacts for Angora rabbits, crafts, and financial analysis. Pre-school opening impacts village with bright yellow uniforms.

Internal: Key leadership are invited in for Common Meal and maneuver planning.

Contradiction: Getting necessary clarity on intensification maneuvers for Expansion Phase. (Wk. 6)

**RIO DE JANEIRO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; pre-school with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

**HAVANA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Human Development Project goes visible as 75 people turn out for a work day on Monday on the village square, brushing 500 feet of roadside banks, building retaining walls, flower beds and gigantic welcome sign, chopping and removing 16 fallen logs; lunch in-kind, prepared, and served to all; first copies of Consult Document roll off the JAMAL Press, resplendent in yellow covers with green and black printing (National Colors).

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON-WOBURN LAWN HDP)**

Internal: Troops abound, as Bingham return from family heritage trek, receive Anthony Braithwaite of Woburn Lawn as new auxiliary; Teresa is sent out to the GRA; lumber arrives to build collegium tables, while Kingston House Maneuver creates space, time and forces designs for expended living.

Contradiction: Securing the materials and finances to do all the tactics while going ahead and launching programs on all fronts with what we have. (Wk. 4)

**MEXICO CITY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is tranformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that a HUD grant of \$270,000 for Delta Pace sewers and a \$2,000 Mobil Oil grant for Medan are approved. Authorization documents produced by the GRA and the India Replication brochure are printed for Order Council. Official approval was given for Development activity in Indonesia. Key Canadian family gives \$5,000 from company and invites \$25,000 proposal to foundation. American Farm Bureau and insurance company networks are anxious to web HDPs into their services, bulletins and personnel. The key contradiction lies in the arena of giving contextual frame and corporate form to breaklooses at the local level and weaving these together into grand maneuvers that catapult Development into the next orbit.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports band meeting in Chicago following Prior's Council writes global maneuvers in a celebrative and argumentative atmosphere. Work begins on Journal selections, Internal Life Guide, and Ecclesiola Manual before discontinuity. Jos ITI (Area Lagos) and the eighth Human Development Training School: Maliwada begin Sunday, August 6th, putting Global Research Centrum back on the road within a week of Council's end. New levels of global feed in promise a creative struggle with the meaning of global commonality. The key contradiction lies in the arena of forging a focused response to the kaleidoscope of all-compelling images of winning coming out of the summer.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the Global Band meeting signified the need to think through global calendar for effective close-at-hand troop usage. House packets are mailed. GSD documentation goes into final draft. Practical vehicles to corporately think through our work as a band of Global Operations in five locations are being brooded through. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the creative tension between particular area needs and global transrational calendar with balanced troop deployment.

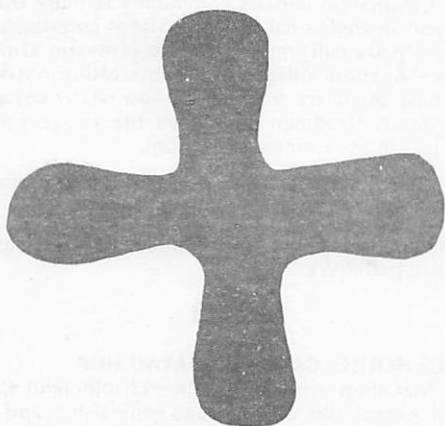
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two more counties are covered with Town Meetings: Somerset and Cornwall. Major responsibility for Powerhouse work is picked up by local leadership in the absence of the auxiliary staff. Thirteen German/Belgian Christian Life Community Youth are hosted enroute to Tai'rgwaith Project.

Internal: Wayside Inn spinning with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use Ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Year of the UK Report sent out to all businessmen who gave monies during the year, bringing in another £30.00. Lining up women's networks for GWF.

Internal: Rupert Barnes surprises House by bringing news of the summer in Chicago and first-hand miracle stories of African leadership. Stuart Hampton and Carol Johnson also keep the information flow and papers moving up North.

Contradiction: Giving permission for the local movement to participate in the catalytic action from their particular location and to sustain their new enthusiasm. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: British Broadcasting Company (BBC2 Wales) spends all day filming in preparation of a nation-wide Welsh program. NCB paints the washery (National Coal Board) and promises to landscape the land which is the entrance to the village. Local company donates blocks for new community company building.

Internal: The Farley family of the Intermediate Technology Group, who offers expertise in building construction visits the Project.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum to finish three month maneuver plan. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meetings are held in Lancashire and North Yorkshire, with one set up for Staffordshire, while group of clergymen in Gateshead consider Town Meeting format in September.

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diann Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Two Italian families visit as sojourners and give Project impetus for Phase II with important resources breakthroughs. One day's victories include promise of aid from agricultural Inspector, bank officials site visit and discussion of first serious loan possibility with local woodworker, arrival of nine unexpected Italians to assist with visits and translation, the finishing of the first 24 umbrellas by the Robin Hood gang from northern England, approval of Co-op legal papers and location of \$2,000 (US) for industry loan. Daily victory reports and hard practical accountability from Italian colleagues catalyze a real sense of corporate power.

Internal: Visitor and Guardian arrive from USA, bringing House number to 29, with auxiliary delightfully outnumbered 7 to 1. All meals are conducted in two languages.

Contradiction: Responding to the necessary style shifts in Italian culture without blunting the radical edge of creating new social forms. (Wk. 8)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Ijede Children's Club opens, reinstating Children's Institute Program, with 120 three, four and five year olds. Teachers end first week with celebration and curriculum planning. Two in-kind IBM selectric typewriters are delivered, and \$6200 (USD) worth of food and materials for the ITI are received.

Internal: Collegium on "Touchstones of Auxiliary Priorship" raises consciousness on practical ways of exercising corporateness.

Contradiction: Keeping critical equipment repaired and maintained in order to spend less time doing repairs. (Wk. 7)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuric and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US ) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Quarter III Dorpsdag (GCF) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House gladly welcomes check for f2,500 (US\$1,250) as a wedding gift to Dick and Monique de Koning. Slide presentation on HDS and the knowledge that local Technical University students have volunteered for HDPs moves Delft Rotary Club to say "yes" to proposal and more support in the future.

Internal: House hosts Richard Kitney, Mark Kocks and Truuske Nortier.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum while doing practical tasks involved in running the House alone. (Wk. 8)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Participation in three-week visit of six youth from Wesel to work in the Kreuzberg Ost Project is great event for all concerned.

Internal: New assignments are welcomed with great anticipation. Area pulls together to staff the work-camp in Kreuzberg Ost as a sign of new things to come.

Contradiction: Holding a helpful tension between being prepared to do it all yourself and waiting for new staff. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Full-time activity preparing for street festival nets over 3,000 DM worth of in-kind, newspaper coverage, operation of sausage, cake, drinks, finger paint and game stands; topped by Guild hosting a Turkish birthday celebration.

Internal: Korean colleague, Park Se Yo, arrives for street festival, bringing added international awareness for both House and community.

Contradiction: Taking time to take a breath and get hold of shifts going on without missing a beat. (Wk. 5)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Celebration impacts community as more than 400 villagers join in traditional dancing. Stakes contribute meal and money. Maize mill grinds three bags of meal in 30 minutes as part of celebration. Villagers experience eating in stakes for the first time. Auxiliary staff moves into nearly completed training center. Headmen encourage the village youth to seriously join in the Community Forum.

Internal: Thomas Masiye comes back from Shantumbu and joins the Farmers' Guild as a volunteer staff.

Contradiction: Going ahead with forces while researching the effective path. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 am—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: FARMTECH provides tractor to plough new cooperative farm. World Neighbors sends \$3500 for next phase of agricultural apprenticeship program. Kawangware Business Association elects sub-management committee for the shop owners in order to deal with the wholesale business. The construction industry is building a house for Mr. Motiga, a colleague in the Vice President's office, on contract. Eleven companies participate in the production of the Kamweleni document, totally inked.

Internal: Seriousness of situation and missional task are brought home in hilarious session of testing knowledge of current maneuvers and Order principles and creating family budgets.

Contradiction: Speeding up the Co-op timeline so that industries function and are self-supporting. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Completion of the four classrooms and two offices, coupled by Canadian funds, causes the community across the river to ask, "What is happening in Kamweleni?" Catholic Development visits Project and offers support.

Internal: Though half of the House is on discontinuity, programs don't miss a beat.

Contradiction: Finding ways to develop community confidence to the point of taking over Project roles. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the Human Development Training School and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25*. (Wk. 13)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Guardians meet to firm up and search for more HDTs candidates.

Internal: House fasts and feasts, celebrating Sheahan Paul's birthday with a beautiful chocolate birthday cake. Marie Paul is sent out to Prior's Council, and Roger Butcher is sent out to Vaviharsh.

Contradiction: Catching the train with a flat tire five miles away from the rail station. (Wk. 7)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: The Blanket Industry produces six blankets in the first training week. Rupees 60,000 in wheat is sanctioned by the government to complete road to the village. Demonstration plots are sprayed with pesticides and fertilizers. District Malaria and Health Official visits Nadlapur and gives cholera vaccinations to 210 residents, one-third of the total population.

Internal: Bus and train strike hinders travel for auxiliary and other travelers in and out of Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Getting into the village more. (Wk. 8)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Income analysis indicates a 10% increase in community income in one month from new pandan material industry; 101 trees planted, lining village entrance and main road.

Internal: House sends Julie Hays to Kuala Lumpur to prepare Canadian Embassy proposal and Development push.

Contradiction: Insuring a shadow with each staff member for public and private sector appointments and all tasks in community. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: After five months of care, chickens begin laying eggs third chicken facility is finished. Mobil Oil donates \$2000 for Consult in Bubun, North Sumatra. Fasting month holiday for pre-school begins. House meets with US AID and Department of Home Affairs to outline steps needed to begin Bubun HDP.

Internal: New intern, Eddy Putra, arrives as new time design and new teams are formed for Islamic fasting month.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum for both staff and village during fasting month. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Bontoa HDP Consult is scheduled for October 8—14.

Internal: New assignments mark the beginning of a new project in the region.

Contradiction: Getting assigned troops on location to begin consult preparation and local framing. (Wk. 7)

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS)**

Internal: Oberg returns from Tokyo trek; Nexus hosts Joanne Slicker enroute from Maliwada to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Maintaining finger on pulse of activity in zone in midst of pulling together year-end reports. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

Internal: Beach birthday party for Becky Cabute and Judy Albers renews everyone's spirits, including the City Mayor's and key Guardians.

Contradiction: Putting new "oomph!!" into ongoing projects. (Wk. 8)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Three participants are recruited for summer program in Oyubari. Two hundred songbooks are printed inkind. Twenty-seven passenger buses begins the journey north to the program.

Internal: Bob Hansen arrives, attends Lutheran conference in Nagano Prefecture, and serves as liturgist for a great House Church.

Contradiction: Building up steam for the fall rather than letting the summer heat sap missional energy. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

Internal: Steve Rhea reports to House on the first week of the GRA.

Contradiction: Using the summer effectively to lay the groundwork for Quarter II. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP**

External: Indianoma Consult began with a tremendous opening feast on Sunday evening, June 24th with 300 local citizens present; two State Senators, the State Representative for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and leading businessmen from the county and state were present.

Internal: Over 100 people attended the Closing Banquet after completing the Saturday Miracle Day. Evening celebration with barbeque and dancing concluded the Consult Week.

Contradiction: Moving ahead rapidly with designed maneuvers in the midst of overwhelming possibility on our hands. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP**

External: Fourth edition of *La Voz* is printed and distributed with paid ads from every business in town; water and sewage systems are researched and needs examined; local citizen volunteers to be librarian.

Internal: Major House rehabilitation is completed with transformed bathroom, new kitchen sink, and rooms partitioned with beautiful paneling.

Contraction: Building community teams to work together on practical tasks. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY**

External: Three USA 12 slide show presentations given and half of additional consultants confirmed with money; plans for GWF are accelerated with visit to Decorator Show House to plan the use of space.

Internal: House sends out Slicker family to Indianoma HDP and celebrates new House configuration with fiesta at Panchos.

Contradiction: Putting together the new configuration of forces to complete the myriad of tasks. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: House plans Summer 78 celebration and send out to lift up Asherton and Indianoma Consults and assignments shifts.

Internal: House gets a much needed face-lift as Adkinsons mysteriously show up to paint first floor.

Contradiction: Objectifying the wisdom gathered from last year's victory so that new eyes can appropriate it quickly and move into the new year. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: Grand opening of expanded laundromat happens with dedication by Chairman of the Board of Alderman; first meeting of the *Prepare for Tomorrow* group is a great event with auxiliary as observers, followed by a fine social hour; plumbing in the restaurant is completed.

Internal: House is overwhelmed by garden produce; spirit collegiums on Bonhoeffer's *Community* paper and the New Reality triangle bring a new depth awareness; Libby Warrick has successful operation.

Contradiction: Holding rites of passage in community maturity with a shift in auxiliary style. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Collegium on saturation intensifies significance of visits to Roman Catholic colleagues during new facility maneuver.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic enables renewed experience of Daily Office with room full of people.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between "looking before you leap" and "he who hesitates is lost". (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: House receives a hand-written thank-you letter from Benton Community in Yazoo County, Mississippi, thanking the ICA for the March Town Meeting, and reports on the initiation of a community park and the strengthening of a dying club.

Internal: A week of discontinuity allows for the welcoming of guests enroute to new assignments.

Contradiction: Creating an imaginal picture of the year that captures the region's attention. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Five Georgian colleagues serve as consultants to the Gibson HDP. In-kindling effort nets 125 pounds of peanut butter and five cases of pickles.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA)**

Internal: Assignment of all troops to locations outside of Atlanta.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the Movement not involved first-hand in the Gibson Project. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: Emerging community leadership bubbles to the surface as residents engage in a Phase II Maneuver Writing Forum. Daily Guild and stake activities result in a visit from professors of North Carolina State University School of Design to examine the potential of the entire train depot building for use as both a community center and restaurant. The Gibson HDP Document is delivered to the households of each stake.

Internal: The Wayside Inn is in full operation with four metro families and families on their way to other posts, enabling major tasks of ordering corporate office and House space.

Contradiction: Releasing the potential power of corporate community leadership by shifting old operating images of the community as an economic wasteland. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Xerox prints Florida Summary Report free and United Telephone sends grant of \$300.

Internal: Church gives two weeks paid so staff can go to Gibson Consult.

Contradiction: Knowing what to do and doing it now to be ready for late August. (Wk. 12)

**CHICAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Materials for India are printed and summer work continues to be refined and published in the transition week after Council ends and before Discontinuity begins.

Internal: Collegiums reflect on the work of the summer, cleaning blitz puts the building in good order for August and task forces are set up to handle ongoing work during the period of discontinuity and resettlement.

Contradiction: Covering all bases during August. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Many Fifth City citizens attend GRA sessions, and GRA visits Fifth City; \$35,000 assured for Elders Action Center; model for summer use of recreation center created, with task force taking charge.

Internal: Headmistress of Woburn Lawn school spends weekend with Lela Mosley; House welcomes Helen Eskridge, Ed Miller and Lela Mosley back from Latin American Consults.

Contradiction: Maintaining a focused time design that will allow significant Council participation, while sustaining ongoing project momentum. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA**

External: Letters from towns in response to the question, "What happened after your town meeting?" report that newsletters, grant requests, cleanup days, more town meetings, joining the PRIDE (state community development program), and plans for a festival are in the works.

Internal: Office decor updated with document covers from each Kansas Town Meeting and six-color timeline.

Contradiction: Moving on while the summer program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: A week of coming and going as seven return from weekend at GRA; and visit to Fifth City; youth gather at 5:30

a.m. each morning to meet detasseling contract with Pioneer Seed Company; first guild meeting launches five guilds, while plans are created for stake float in Watermelon Day Parade at first stake meeting.

Internal: Visitors flood through, making global collegue-ship a reality, with impromptu Indian feast for community and House capping the week.

Contradiction: Creating leadership training models to turn willing helpers into confident leaders. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Metro colleagues travel to Lorimor for street dance celebration.

Internal: Twelve metro colleagues continue House Church, Ecclesiola and House renovation, while House members attend Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving beyond operating out of old regionalis images. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Three Vista salaries are secured for Kinney auxiliary with three more available after October.

Internal: Minneapolis House serves as the continental Wayside Inn as travelers on their way to new assignments keep every room filled.

Contradiction: Keeping missional engagement at its unrelenting pace while discontinuity plans are also being carried out. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Colleague in nearby town calls with news of his town's request for a series of Town Meetings.

Internal: Entire House in Chicago to participate in co-sensing on next year's directions at Priors Council.

Contradiction: Discerning advantages when Town Meeting documents are in three different Houses and evaluations are incomplete. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Twelve kids form Voice delivery team to kick off weekly program with four mile hike to the river.

Internal: Auxiliary house yard facelift and clearing of drainage ditch builds community confidence and recalls the importance of ICA space visibility.

Contradiction: Enabling a growing group to create and implement their own maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDPs along the way.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE)**

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDPs right here at home. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: House receives letter from Hospital Heights in the City of New Castle, describing remarkable accomplishments since June 14 Town Meeting. Jeanne Wilson is sent to Michigan to prepare Department of Labor proposal for GWF across Michigan.

Internal: House paints new worship room, E.G. room and collegium room, celebrates two E.G. birthdays, sends out Ruth Landmann to new assignment and enjoys visit by Mary D'Souza.

Contradiction: Designing a model for self-support which provides flexible use of time and plenty of money. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Great Kentucky Cotillion is finished in grand style—all 120 counties are GOLDEN.

Internal: Cotillion celebration with colleagues, with sendout of Jim Armour to the Widen Consult and Shirley St. John to the Alabama Campaign.

Contradiction: Gathering all loose ends in order to focus on the summer. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Council participants meet to rehearse maneuver building methodology in preparation for Guild's Quarter I maneuver workshop. Town Meeting campaign receives check in mail from Sears, Detroit group, for \$300 and readies cars for circuits.

Internal: House completes necessary construction on in-kind facility and symbolizes the year's new game with in-kind seats at Lions' pre-season opening football game.

Contradiction: Naming the immediate victory that claims the new year for the entire region. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: The Cleveland Saturation Experiment continues beyond its goal with requests being called in and Town Meetings being held in more pivotal neighborhoods.

Internal: Celebration of return from Brazil Consult of Lois Reeves and Mike Tippett elicits two more HDP volunteer decisions.

Contradiction: Maintaining volunteer momentum by Town Meeting saturation. (Wk. 4)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: The Wayside Inn discovers there are always enough beds and food to receive and send out the Movement to Europe, India, Africa, Hong Kong, Egypt and the USA.

Internal: The radical sign of the marriage covenant is celebrated with a compelling congregational dinner conversation and the gathering of the families and friends from the globe toward the solemnizing of the Price-Boivin covenant.

Contradiction: Designing a regional briefing on summer '78 that empowers positioning of next year with giant steps. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Metro participates in the dynamic of GRA: reports and research.

Internal: Area data gathering reminds us of care and accountability.

Contradiction: Articulating activity of programs as profound humanness so that formulated region sees itself filling all GSF roles. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Excursion to Buffalo Metro in a newly repaired car allows ICA staff to meet old colleagues and gather data to support the Quarter II Town Meeting saturation "push".

External: Momentum continues as local young adult picks up leadership role with the Living Environment-Task Force. The printshop reports its first \$1000 day and a nine-year-old Jet contributes an article for the "Voice".

Internal: The community sends out five auxiliary to other projects with a celebrative dinner of half-smokes and trimmings. Indian colleagues present an intriguing collegium on replication.

Contradiction: Daring to put on paper the demands of Quarter II in the midst of the ambiguity of Quarter I. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Governor's Office of Economic and Community Development invites the House to present the Town Meeting program to the Ravenswood City Council, which vote unanimously to set a TM date for October 24, 1978.

Internal: Denise Stanley arrives to join the skateboarders of Widen, while Joe and Carol Pierce, together with Mr. and Mrs. Hunt (Carol's parents), join the House for House Church.

Contradiction: Thinking logistically and getting supplies arranged ahead of time so that troops don't disengage. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Six-week Development task force ends its first phase of setting the stage with much in-kind ceramic tile, increasing list of donor prospects to contact, and 30 letters sent which will initiate the process of building networks for in-kind and for foundation proposals. Internal: Festive send-out gathering for Eloise Patton, Stan Crow, and Larry and Mary Ward lifts up the greatness and promise of each and sends them out to have their creativity used around the globe.

Contradiction: Creating the design of the regional briefing so that it empowers with giant steps the positioning for the next year. (Wk. 8)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Loisada (New York City) colleagues are hosted by Starks community on workday. A playground is designed and "River of Tomorrow" historical drama is written and cast.

Internal: The Higgins, Whitneys and Tolmans visit Starks, bringing global news.

Contradiction: Juggling time and forces to make scheduled events come off. (Wk. 7)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Colleagues call in to keep abreast of what is going on. Area packet with preparatory materials for Area Council and phone calls, indicate the Area and Region are alive and well.

Internal: Mark Witney completes summer school and is sent out on discontinuity.

Contradiction: Establishing a milieu of victory immediately which entices colleagues to decide to be counted among the Global Servant Force. (Wk. 8)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: The chance to visit Starks HDP with four Charlotteville residents elicits a wild spin of ideas and a determination to win. A Project meeting results in decisions about work projects so that a new sense of corporate decision-making turns the defeat of a cancelled speaker into an overwhelming victory.

Internal: A collegium on curriculum-building occasions new comprehensiveness in planning.

Contradiction: Creating symbols of community cohesiveness. (Wk. 8)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Advanced program contacts pay off as we receive calls and set appointments for Youth Forums and GWF. Great Week 7 HDP workday involves four regional colleagues.

Internal: Whole House present with the arrival of the Stocks.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the whole task while trying to engage colleagues in the task. (Wk. 8)

Contradiction: Holding futuristic vision for House in midst of everything seeming to draw to a close. (Wk. 3)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Lornecraft Furniture Division debuts with first exhibition outside county. New Day Canada mailing completed and three teams cover New Brunswick.

Internal: Report of Hermel Lapointe and Muriel Chamberlain on GRA at Ecclesiola represents not only community, but also ICA.

Contradiction: Sustaining motivity and corporate work patterns in the face of continuing struggle to get on necessary deeds of summer. (Wk. 7)

## **CARACAS**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Youth summer program is launched and highlighted by a day-long pre-school outing to the zoo in Caracas.

Internal: Auxiliary entertains landscape architect who creates image of a flowering plaza, catalyzing enthusiasm for the plaza building.

Contradiction: Being trapped into sustaining the project rather than creating corporate, life-giving events. (Wk. 7)

## **BUENOS AIRES**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Agriculture Guild meets with 45 farmers to discuss plan for crop planting and negotiate prices with a buyer-exporter who has taken interest in the project. Commercial moves ahead on plans and contacts for Angora rabbits, crafts, and financial analysis. Pre-school opening impacts village with bright yellow uniforms.

Internal: Key leadership are invited in for Common Meal and maneuver planning.

Contradiction: Getting necessary clarity on intensification maneuvers for Expansion Phase. (Wk. 6)

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; pre-school with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary: Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO)**

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

**HAVANA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Human Development Project goes visible as 75 people turn out for a work day on Monday on the village square, brushing 500 feet of roadside banks, building retaining walls, flower beds and gigantic welcome sign, chopping and removing 16 fallen logs; lunch in-kind, prepared, and served to all; first copies of Consult Document roll off the JAMAL Press, resplendent in yellow covers with green and black printing (National Colors).

Internal: Troops abound, as Bingham return from family heritage trek, receive Anthony Braithwaite of Woburn Lawn as new auxiliary; Teresa is sent out to the GRA; lumber arrives to build collegium tables, while Kingston House Maneuver creates space, time and forces designs for expended living.

Contradiction: Securing the materials and finances to do all the tactics while going ahead and launching programs on all fronts with what we have. (Wk. 4)

**MEXICO CITY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is tranformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

General Motors gives \$1,000 for Sol de Septiembre project in Chile. In Canada, Molson Brewery gives \$5,000 for Lorne and Vogar while in the U.S., \$50,000 is authorized from EDA and \$40,000 from HUD for initiating the USA 12. Global travel funds raised tops \$25,000 as people prepare to relocate to new assignments. Chicago Nexus collegiums on each Centrum illuminate many possibilities for coordinated efforts between Development and other centrum to heighten our effectivity. The contradiction is in the arena of providing sophisticated support systems for new orbits of authorization and funding and heightened visibility.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports that Academy registrations flow in from Egypt, Germany, Hong Kong, Britain, Australia, Guam, Philippines and North America. The next Journal is prepared for final edit and includes suggestions from around the globe. The HDTS faculty training manual moves towards completion. The breakloose came in realizing how Research Centrum can effectively happen around the globe. The contradiction lies in the arena of focus for the coming year and discovering the new movement forms consonant with our sense of the new reality.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports the Pisinerno Arizona HDP site is given the go ahead by Papago Indian District Council and consult is set for October 8—14. Alaska site selection is launched with consult October 29—November 4. Materials are created for North American Area Councils Week 10 and a representative is sent to Edmonton Council. Breakthroughs come in clarifying Area Council workshops and materials and Latin American Health Trek set-up for Weeks 11 and 12. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting the ongoing necessary work done in the midst of preparing to do Quarter II maneuvers.

## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum Band meets in Chicago following the Global Prior's Council to work through common operations for the year. Trust/Task Fund usage, the recommendation for Global Mission Funds and Institute cash flow are emphasized. After the Year of Management there is readiness to do Management as a global band. The key contradiction lies in the arena of keeping the right hand knowing what the left hand is doing.
