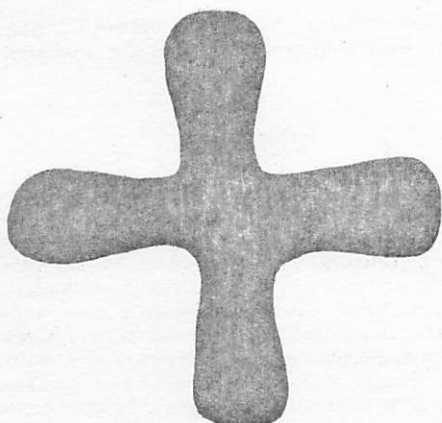

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: First Tai'rgwaith/Isle of Dogs Project interchange is actuated with weekend in Tai'rgwaith. Highlights include the practical experience of being part of a network of demonstration projects by local people and decision of Kath Sim to "wear the blue" and self-consciously care for women in Tai'rgwaith. Two GWFs and two CYFs are firm for London Metro Weeks 8-9. Framing continues with visits to YWCA and National Council of Women who give strong affirmation of work.

Internal: House attends *The Girlfriends* as part of ecclesiola and meet John Dunne with great anticipation of the study.

Contradiction: Building the whole bridge with only one fourth of the planks. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two great Panchayat evenings merge old faces and new into a fresh invitation to engagement in the region. Recognition of ICA's charitable status brings 50% reduction in House taxes.

Internal: House bulges at the seams as Dyhrs try to settle-in 24 hours ahead of Panchayat visit team, bringing competition for bathroom and bedroom space.

Contradiction: Utilizing additional forces in meaningful catalytic engagement and not just busy-ness. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Local people begin to pick up initiative and responsibility as Management Board figures out ways to erect building. Vanessa Williams requests away to become a member of the auxiliary. Local paper boy puts the *Vision* on his route. A GWF, TM in Godre'rgralg, and Assembly in Tai'rgwaith, where a new song is written, sum up week of wild activity.

Internal: House is heartened by new possibilities of self-support from Inland Revenue.

Contradiction: Locating the visible whistle points that release action. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Various events launch Manchester and New Castle strongholds as circuter and House members attend minister colleague induction, Young Christian Workers meeting, show Social Demonstration slides to New Castle Robin Hood Gang youth, and hold two potential steering committee meetings.

Internal: Permeator lands first temporary job while continuing permanent job interviews and traveling to London for GWF pedagogy—all in same day.

Contradiction: Creating a "rider" for strongholds that embodies the urgency of the mission. (Wk. 6)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Week of Development opens contacts with religious orders in Paris. Slide show with 20 Oblate and Benedictine Sisters is highlighted with opening address given by Bishop Mathews.

Internal: The House is honored by an Indian curry dinner prepared by Bishop and Mrs. Mathews and gift of a bottle of wine from Cana, Israel.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum going on two fronts at once. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The *Cooperativa Artiganale* (Industrial Co-op) signs legal document. Ten members celebrate with champagne. Guardian event in Rome with Panchayat promises further help with marketing and authorization. Two staff are invited to guild family wedding feast. Town Meeting is set up and assisted by two Terminese.

Internal: Panchayat visitation with Vance, Epps, Parker, Pesek and Lyn Mathews brings welcome pause and opportunity for global objectivity and news.

Contradiction: Recruiting Italian circuiters to keep up with the openness of Italian villages and networks. (Wk. 7)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Ibadan circuit sets up six CYFs for Weeks 11 and 12, and GWF for Week 9. In kind bulldozer arrives and clears most of industrial park site in four days. Sewing factory begins production on new contract for pillows and makes 500 plus in one day. Four kilos of tomatoes are sold to Kingsway for high price, breaking loose Commerce Guild. Development begins to reap results of Guardians Meeting with 1300 nira in hand.

Internal: House sends out Lin Wisman to North America with Yoruba celebration, including 40 guests from the village, eba and fish stew, and lots of singing.

Contradiction: Providing expertise beyond that of the staff. (Wk. 8)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The Guardians' event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakening and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyshock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Twenty Guardians welcome Panchayat and actively participate in workshop on Dorpsdag, as well as volunteering time and offering hospitality. One more colleague joins circuit force.

Internal: Sr. Yvonne Guenec from France breaks open religious order facility possibilities in the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Operating out of contradiction-oriented, rather than goal-oriented, images of victory. (Wk. 7)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: After the fantastic Nieder Henninger TM held at the Frankfurt House, within three days the circuiters set up five more TMs—four of which are in new polises—as well as hold the TM they hit the road to do this week. In a 20 minute Development call, pastor of the Reformed Church predicts he will raise at least USD 5,000 to 8,000 from his church after HDP slide show which he scheduled for January.

Internal: Movitivity hits a new level as two teams go out to do TM circuits while another goes out to do Development, leaving the folks at home to enjoy a fine ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Figuring out how to demonstrate in 216 polises that they have no problems, only challenges. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Five TM presentations and three Kreuzberg Ost presentations are set up in Hamburg for January. House receives four yeses to requests for Kreuzberg Ost funding of key programs. All Christmas Market flyers are printed. Pan American wives visit and German-American women set up visit for next week. Development team gets feet into Catholic religious orders in Berlin.

Internal: Brian Williams' weekly visit begins and helps kick off a long-range Development push.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between trusting the community leadership and getting all the programs done. (Wk. 9)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Week of "Economic Groundwork" in Kapini HDP sees arrival of maize and fertilizer for 40-acre scheme, 100 farmers meeting to discuss starting a co-op, Kapini HDP Credit Union briefing attended by 130 enthusiastic residents, the first Lusaka Guardians' Meeting bringing new depth of commitment, letter from the President's Office to EEC verifying government support of the Kapini HDP, the distribution of seed packets to Kapini HDP families for home gardens, the graduation of 10 farm trainees and grand Independence Day celebration with iron men marching off to their stakes at 6:00 AM to plant new "freedom (notice) boards" in each stake node.

Internal: High level spirit spin on the "missing blue radio" and ecclesiola conversation on "The Enemy" lend humor and perspective to the contingencies of corporate living.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between the main road and the Project site before the rains set in. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bricking and mudding of old guild hall walls transform a tumble-down building into a community center of which the village can be proud.

Internal: A felucca load of plants, a rationalized and beautified kitchen and beginning the white-washing of the stairwell empowers the House with image of an oasis in the desert.

Contradiction: Broadening the base of village participation in all facets of economic and social development. (Wk. 9)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Bill Pierce and Richard Holloway of Appropriate Technology International spend much of week visiting Kawangware and Kameleni, and invite proposal for Kawangware. Stake meetings are re-launched with great excitement and release people in Stake 2 to initiate and implement workday. Water tank and tires are delivered to Kameleni. Guild buckles down and concretizes miracle timeline for the quarter. E.A. Power and Lighting finally gets meter in after only waiting for two years. Now the borehole is functional. Talk is given to Rotary Club as an up-date to their loan for completion of the nursery school. They will build another when the loan is repaid. Banana fiber emergency sends staff out to new experience of cutting and hauling the fiber.

Internal: Peter Malaba arrives from Ijede via Lusaka with news that staff in Kapini is well.

Contradiction: Identifying the real death ground that releases momentum, funds, resources and troops. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP**

External: Progress on the Community Center is pushed forward with 90% completion of the roof, paving the way for re-establishing regular HDP headquarters in one week. Site visits increase on both a drop-in and scheduled basis, signalling the significance of Kamweleni administration of rural development for all of Kenya. Unsettled and partially constructed central building signals to visitors that demonstration can be underway in any conditions.

Internal: House welcomes Peter Malaba, temporary auxiliary until Continental Council, who immediately moves in to gun agriculture.

Contradiction: Catalyzing effective demonstration in the midst of troop and material shortages and facility disorganization. (Wk. 9)

**BOMBAY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: The three-hour Gram Sabha is launched causing great awakenment events—three done in two days in Ratnagiri District.

Internal: First declared discontinuity is structured around Duwali celebration for six days.

Contradiction: Utilizing media tools to expand auxiliary's practical vision and planning. (Wk. 9)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: House sends 17 from Delhi Area to the ninth HDS in Maliwada. The second *shrahamdan* (workday) in Sikroar does 150 meters of road. Thirty-nine families are surveyed, beginning the village health survey. Delhi colleague, Shri Niwas Gaur, inkind a truckload each of crushed cobblestones and gravel and an inkind truck for the Project.

Internal: Premod Penna from Management Centrum works to complete the 1977-78 books, while a dozen different colleagues are in and out, working on various aspects of the HDP.

Contradiction: Reconciling transportation costs now that company authorization has slipped. (Wk. 9)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Personal invitations are delivered to metro colleagues during visitation campaign to attend two upcoming metro events. First edition of area UPDATE is mailed.

Internal: House opens bank account, symbolizing to establishment that ICA office in Calcutta is serious about intent to work in this area.

Contradiction: Shifting established operating images on other side of this week's Continental Council. (Wk. 5)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Visit with Bishop Yap renews old acquaintances and "we are still here" kind of response. Chats with colleagues reveal keen interest in the Projects and sharing what has been happening over the past year.

Internal: House readies for "The Queen" (Area Project Priors meeting) with refreshing decor, delicious meals, informal collegiality sessions and, in general, care for the troops.

Contradiction: Deciding to be both Community Left and Community Right as more than half of the adults assigned are away on various maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Dignitaries from District Office and Handicrafts Association arrive one day after originally scheduled event, creating new excitement for Handicrafts Guild and deciding to fund building for handicrafts industry.

Internal: District Office visits Serusup and decides to fund rehabilitation of a community house for ICA staff house.

Contradiction: Keeping programs operating with no way to get supplies in due to broken ferry. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGLAI LUI**

External: MARA begins a three times a week tailoring course for 28 women including the nurse from the first aid station who's overheard telling an incoming patient, "Sorry, I'm going to tailoring class." Meanwhile, 50 men not to be out-done, march past the class on their way to the rice fields for a special work day. Two motorized and two hand fertilizer sprayers arrive just in time for a guild meeting with a decision to continue without salaries for the second month just to assure a win. The *tadeke* (preschool) begins its seven-week holiday to coincide with the school holiday.

Internal: Kim and Ruth return from Singapore meeting with all kinds of news from the area.

Contradiction: Re-empowering the national slogan, *Bersatu*, meaning unity, at the local level. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Staff and villager visit tapioca chip factory and Indonesian People's Bank to collect information about government rice program. U.S. delegation to World Forestry visits Kelapa Dua. Nests are finished for second chicken house. Chickens begin laying with 30 eggs total in first five days. Maneuvers are planned for two months with 20 villagers participating in the planning. Philips Ralin Electronics shows videotape of the movie, *The Message*, to Kelapa Dua village and staff. USAID proposal rewrite is submitted. House receives Indonesian government letter of permission for Bontoa Project.

Internal: Udin, first Kelapa Dua villager, joins the staff.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with fantastic breakloose. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: After being silent during weekly maneuver planning, village women come forth and plan their own *gotong royong* (work day) and gather to lay plans for a *pandan* (weaving) and a sewing industry.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates the completion of an enclosed kitchen with a feast of chicken curry by catching one of the chickens that had previously invaded the kitchen area daily.

Contradiction: Releasing the village to participate in the planning instead of turning to ICA as answer. (Wk 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Push on inking produces printing of document, literacy supplies, materials for the Mosque, lumber for *Wisma Bontoa* (staff house), three pumps and well digging by Health Department, and translation of ecclesiola book.

Internal: House works on internal economics, setting all budgets and clarifying in-House assignments.

Contradiction: Setting up functional structures for comprehensive village participation. (Wk. 9)

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Development circuiters return for week-long PSU which includes evaluation, strategizing, mid-quarter remaneuvering and compiling reports to the areas and global band.

Internal: Nexus celebrates victories of the first half of the quarter with an outing to a Chinese bazaar and ice cream sundaes.

Contradiction: Discerning operating configurations that allow for both flexibility and victory. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: The second round of negotiations between the Nam Wai Foundation Ltd. and land development companies takes place as the final day for completing sale of all individually owned land to the Foundation approaches. At the end of a Development trek, \$1,000 USD is received, two checks are in the mail and one large donation is promised. Unrelenting visibility campaign has villagers planting flowers and removing weeds, with volunteers arising from stake meetings.

Internal: A study of *Our Corporate Vocation* catalyzes creative reflection on both individuals' journeys and the profound function of an order in history.

Contradiction: Maintaining a long-range vision without being swallowed up by the short-range advantages. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Auxiliary and preschool exchange spaces in order to open the Community Education Center with intensified youth programs and makes the need for expanded facilities an indicative fact. Detailed village land use map displays changes of the village since the Consult.

Internal: New auxiliary kitchen brings a constant stream of visitors from the village.

Contradiction: Developing local village leadership beyond the elected officials. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: AID promises to give four times more than last year's budget to fund the eight new villages. PBSP promises to double last year's budget. One week's Development push produces 23,000 pesos of the quarter's 100,000 in-hand.

Internal: Project Directors meet in Manila for week-long work and planning session.

Contradiction: Creating the next maneuvers in midst of carrying out the present maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Two thousand workbook covers are donated for TM campaign by a printer in Kaohsiung.

Internal: Team from Hong Kong Development Centrum arrives for two-week maneuver.

Contradiction: Forging Development story which incorporates the new reality of the TM campaign in Taiwan. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Industry module of HDTS comes alive as village managers teach the module and workday teaches the prospective industry managers from cluster villages two new industrial skills. Arrival of three citizens of Oombulgurri radically addresses school with globality and brings whole village to the windows of the school. Craft industry receives grant to develop new designs for products. Rock marketing trip to Manila breaks open new leads.

Internal: Youth cluster holds ecclesiola with newly received Dunne book with great style.

Contradiction: Creating the event, now that Sudtonggan Secretariat can make decisions for the village. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Sewing industry goes into full production with four machines in full-time use. New *nito* (palm) craft samples are finished. Third delivery of charcoal is ready, and 60 bricks are made for firing. Nursery building is completed with seedboxes, fencing and plowing. First section of Training Center is finished, enabling three families to move into new house. Preschool has two field trips and class room area is renovated. Ten participants are sent to Sudtonggan HDTS.

Internal: House receives Bill Newkirk and Development team of Roy Philbrook and Dick Sims as guests for week.

Contradiction: Increasing the involvement of the people of Langub. (Wk. 9)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The Development team visits a company and finds that it is open to a proposal for money and manpower for conducting Town Meetings. This is an exciting breakthrough for involving Japanese in the Town Meeting program and opens possibilities of similar proposals and involvement. A successful HRM is held in the town of Kamisawa.

Internal: A representative from the Hong Kong Nexus joins in the viewing and evaluating of a possible new house.

Contradiction: Maintaining Town Meeting as number one priority. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: The *Village Bulletin* is again being published and distributed throughout the "bans" by villagers. Three charts explaining the organization of the Village Treasury (LEV) are placed in the Village Hall, Health Outpost and Training Center. Holt Foundation representative, Village Chief, Rev. Choi of the Methodist Church and ICA meet together to give new direction to preschool.

Internal: Eighteen Methodist seminary graduates and three Methodist pastors make site visit and discuss with the auxiliary the new role of the church.

Contradiction: Needing a practical day-to-day relationship with the village that allows maneuvering with the village for a comprehensive plan for local leadership. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU ERI HDP**

External: Cow shed walls go up while all wait anxiously for official permission to build it. Exposure continues with visits by official from Department of Home Affairs, T.J. Coolidge, and Mr. Paek, president of local manufacturing firm.

Internal: Internal life moves away from the cold collegium center room into the imaginative relief of the two floor-heated perimeter rooms.

Contradiction: Letting loose a late fall blaze of Project activity that hot coals remain on the other side of the mid-winter village retreat. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Staff go on Okinawa trek for selection of HDP site as 40 villages are visited. Help from the Jaycees and colleague, Michiko Kawasaki, brings back very helpful first-hand report. Development win of 79,000 yen in-hand includes party with 30 students and others paying 1,000 yen and bringing their own food and drinks. In Nagasaki, House trains 20 laymen to do a large community TM in March to commemorate 25th anniversary of church congregation.

Internal: K. Bauknight gives two collegiums on Development to give House new image, style and plan for Development.

Contradiction: Journeying colleagues to say yes to the task. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Week is highlighted by great Osaka GWF and LENS/TM circuits. One Guardian recruits four people to LENS.

Internal: Regional colleague pulls off a great ecclesiola study by using the tried and true charting methodology when another colleague becomes ill and cannot continue with the prepared study.

Contradiction: Launching a massive Development push in the midst of holding a LENS, GWF and continuing TM circuits. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: GWF meeting with Sapporo church women sets date for GWF pedagogy. Michael Shaw is sent out on TM circuit and reports date set in November for Fukushima City. Mr. Tonosaki is sent out to Japan Guardians Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Oyubari House hosts 14 guests for informal evening on Saturday night; includes drop-in from Switzerland, making 24th nation to visit OHDP.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to Oyubari as a demonstration. (Wk. 5)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: House plans with the Wedge team area maneuvers through Quarter II.

Internal: Ellen Rebstock visits and brings Centrum dynamic to area Development and authorization.

Contradiction: Dealing with immediacies while being chaste about determined priorities. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Speaking engagement with Melville High School students releases the possibility of at least one for India. Home Community Meeting in Badgingarra opens door for several more as saturation wagon gains speed.

Internal: Guardian car dealer lends car while he resurrects House's old one.

Contradiction: Strategizing the releasing activities for the next six weeks. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Southeast circuit results in two CMA dates being set. Successful Guardians' dinner is held in small country town of Riverton, using Global Slide Show. Murrin Bridge paint team date is approved.

Internal: Hilde Betonte lands job on Thursday and is working that night.

Contradiction: Conveying the death ground to all those willing to die in the Adelaide Region. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Phase I of CMA: Victoria Campaign is completed as 12 state committee members say yes and Sir Reginald Sholl says yes to be Honorary Consultant.

Internal: Ecclesiola experiences "passing over" and "coming back" on Westgate Bridge opening day.

Contradiction: Getting House on death ground that will let it risk an unclear position into an unknown future. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: Visits to five cities in eight days take place for referrals from "heavy" economic sector, to four Federal Cabinet Ministers to set stage for "Year of Australia". Peter Derham, Director of large Melbourne company, writes three introductory letters on first-name basis to Cabinet, while two other Directors offer to come and introduce ICA to Cabinet.

Internal: Banks, Oakley and Spencer cover 6,000 miles in eight days in every kind of conveyance except bullock cart for authorization trips.

Contradiction: Creating new arms to do "the real programs", CTC and CMA, while everyone is full steam on authorization and site selection. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: Third site selection trek sets off with Wedge team to see the five possibilities for Queensland HDP. In-kind push yields set of tires and parts for Holden. Petrol proposals are in the mail. Data gathering is done on five possible sites.

Internal: House walls expand once again as Wedge team comes to stay.

Contradiction: Making colleagues out of acquaintances. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: Three pass first-aid course. Women begin dress-making. Murrin Bridge Magpies football team is organized by community and wins its first game. Auxiliary launches a series of guest nights with showing of GSD slides.

Internal: Wedge/area team visits and shares recent brooding on intents of the next 10 years.

Contradiction: Nurturing the signs of new decision to build community. (Wk. 8)

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: First Majuro HDP newspaper is published and distributed, called the *Showplace Nuj* (News).

Internal: Thanksgiving is adopted by the *Showplace*, as they appoint a committee to help the House plan the guest list and prepare the traditional feast.

Contradiction: Symbolizing the differentness of the various guild dynamics when all the different guild members are the same people. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: With the move into Salani Village, Consult preparation breaks loose in the arena of in-kind, authorization, consultant recruitment, Development and village home survey.

Internal: Move from six-room house to one room *fale* (no walls), grounds winds of change dynamic in midst of total exposure.

Contradiction: Creating new use of time and space that "moves" in the midst of dispersed corporateness. (Wk. 7)

### **SAN FRANCISCO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Development trek energizes possibility of money-seeking blitz with over \$4000 in hand. LENS team secures initial yes for LENS from Hewlett Packard and Levi Strauss.

Internal: J. Dunne study relentlessly engages House in midst of mid-course remaneuvering and writing.

Contradiction: Hitting the line with a whompf, rather than a trickle. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP**

External: New level of collegueship and commitment in the global task blossoms after CYF and GWF in Cusick. Signs announcing location of future site of expanded grocery store, shopping mall and present site of mini-park are put up.

Internal: House and Project are impacted by global presence of Barbara U're, Joan Knutsen and Carol Henshaw.

Contradiction: Telling the story that allows the community to see that saturation and the Project are one thing, not many small do's. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Twelve target strongholds are reprioritized after last four forays are completed, and a journey is charted for each one.

Internal: First attempts at food budget paring net one celebrative dinner and a \$5.00 bag of groceries.

Contradiction: Creating and executing new marching orders to deal with daily shifts in missional advantage and strategies. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Current maneuvers produce three TMs each in one day. Visits to "grads" of first maneuver prove TM is indeed an awakening event.

Internal: A pause for ecclesiola in the midst of too much to do gives everyone a second wind.

Contradiction: Creating an image of how to do urban block TMs to release key strategy. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP**

External: T-shirts go on sale at community meeting, while a plan is created for sales at Papago Rodeo. Recreation guild uses proceeds for youth activities.

Internal: House attends village send-out feast for Fr. Lambert, village Franciscan priest and colleague.

Contradiction: Catalyzing broad-based participation for extended period of time for major improvement events. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY**

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

External: Development wins on three fronts with \$200 from Montana Power for Montana TM Report, CYF presentation to the four downtown banks, and CYF proposal submitted to Penrey Company.

Internal: Breakdown of car throws House into contest as pedestrian records are set by Emerging Generation, youth and adults of three miles, two miles and one mile daily.

Contradiction: Focusing troop power in order to push through break-opens, rather than too many actions spreading House thin. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP**

External: Cannon Ball Industries delivers first shipment of Trash Barros, hosts guests who visit to explore new product line, and takes possession of the TRAG, complete with all USA and Canadian manufacturing and marketing rights.

Internal: Great workday, which completes day care office and insulates store ceiling, ends with fine celebration of a poker game, with Joe Two Bear winning all the money, then contributing the pennies to the House.

Contradiction: Incorporating revolutionary methods into the new wave of bureaucratic support of the Project. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Sunnyside (N.W. Denver) maneuver ends having engaged 15 colleagues, with fantastic Assembly and concrete proposals, leaving an inner city community that is ready to move! Salt Lake City plans two maneuvers for early 1979.

Internal: Celebration at House, after completion of the Sunnyside maneuver, nets fine evaluation in midst of profound collegiality.

Contradiction: Tackling the irritants and deterrents before they stall maneuver momentum. (Wk. 8)

## EDMONTON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Colleague formation is the theme of the week, with four-page newsletter sent across region and three strategy sessions on saturation which elicit great responses from forum grads. One colleague is excited about attending Minto Consult and another about driving to Williams Lake GWF.

Internal: Another fine ecclesiola marks the end of the week of "record-income-making" as well as models for more jobs.

Contradiction: Enlivening the structures that release momentum for saturation. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Visit of Development team sees House thermometer rise to \$1400 and establishment of permanent files, tracking systems and grassroots mailing list of 500 people.

Internal: House celebrates Development breakloose with local colleagues at \$100 meal donated by Keg and Cleaver restaurant.

Contradiction: Moving with power into new saturation in midst of financial squeeze. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Regional colleagues with new faces among them enable the moving of the ICA office and war room. Finishing touches are being put on a fine Development proposal to be submitted to major corporations.

Internal: Two Development collegiums on maneuvering and "failure syndrome" address the spirit struggle of the House.

Contradiction: Mopping up millions of maneuver mangling minutia. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: House touches bases in four out of six polises, netting in-hand Development, a scheduled CYF and possibilities of other awakening events.

Internal: Combination event, Evening at the Institute and sending out John Scoville to India for a month, gathers both old and new colleagues and addresses all with global slides and global story.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues to engage in decision to do saturation. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Metis colleagues go with House to see Senator Molgatt and volunteer four days on Forum set up. Vogar Voyagers (youth corps) pull off live-band-dance for profit of \$65 and organize themselves for full schedule of activities. Wabba-Won Quilts sends off Gay and Elsie Desjarlais to exhibit at International Interior Design Show in Toronto.

Internal: Canada World Youth, an exchange program, sends four sojourners to Vogar (two Bolivians/two Canadians).

Contradiction: Revealing the urgency about economic enterprises so that leaders will obtain needed skills. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Alice maneuver team returns home triumphant. Week is spent evaluating and setting up next tri-micro saturation. House is invited to Riverside Civic Club (Houston neighborhood) to help plan their second Town Meeting. Metro circuits are initiated with Week II trip to Austin.

Internal: Richard Kauffman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Economic development team visits Indianhoma, working on commercial, industrial and environmental funding packages. Grocery store is focus of the week. Playground work begins with inkinded materials.

Internal: Youth go to Panhandle Future Farmers of America meat-judging for the weekend.

Contradiction: Advancing full speed ahead with targeted groups for workday blitzes. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: CYF sponsored by St. Jude's Church in San Antonio has 70 participants who bridge the north and west sides of the city. Staff visits local FHA and MET directors, and attends Rural Health Initiative Seminar in Uvalde. Library has bake sale to raise money for electric bill. Stakes make plans for clean-up projects.

Internal: House extends gas lines to three more rooms in preparation for winter.

Contradiction: Doing maneuvers instead of tactics. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House winds up one maneuver and begins another with Burkburnett TM (Cleburne, Texas) and mailing of quarter calendar to Oklahoma City metro colleagues.

Internal: The House completes facility set-up with opening of guest space in refurbished garage.

Contradiction: Welding all the troops and tasks into one thrust through structural continuity. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Two TMs and one CYF complete three weeks of saturation in the Cleburne tri-micro with a total of 23 events. Burkburnett TM workshops are led by local citizens with excellent results.

Internal: Thanksgiving is celebrated at House Church with turkey, cornicopia, Pilgrim drama and Phase One participation.

Contradiction: Staffingsaturation maneuvers with local troops and engaging regional colleagues globally. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Crossroads TM has 109 present. GWF planning meeting ends with 14 excited key Jackson women. Restaurant renovation continues with inkind by two community residents. Pace codes/ordinances are completed as model for Mississippi small towns. Preschool funding intensifies with \$3200 contribution from Delta Foundation, and local flea market and fish dinner nets \$190. VISTA contract is signed by Mayor for six community slots.

Internal: House inkinds a quarter of venison from community hunters.

Contradiction: Using the next month as an authorization springboard for the next TM: Mississippi maneuver. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Maneuver Prep III begins as Bougalousa Maneuver winds up with assembly and slide show.

Internal: The Olive family comes from Mississippi to participate in ecclesiola celebration, ending with movie, *Goodbye Girl*.

Contradiction: Actualizing three maneuvers while keeping to one task of building the Earth. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Jackson, Mississippi stronghold moves into new orbit as \$25,000 is committed from Governor's office of volunteer services and as 12 TMs, one CYF and one Assembly are completed with six more TMs set and one GWF to be held in the Mississippi governor's mansion.

Internal: Permeator lands second part-time job as Transart Accessory designer and begins first part-time job as Girl Friday to key Guardian.

Contradiction: Developing quick methods and materials that allow people a way to talk about what TM is and why they would do one. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Carter Country Call Maneuver ends with an assembly and TM in Plains, attended by all three key Plains families, regional colleagues and local volunteers. Visit from Operations and Gibson gives House a chance to look at remaneuvering with real situation.

Contradiction: Naming the one pivotal victory in the midst of the multiple demands on missional time. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: First experiment with saturation results in four events in Gibson HDP in five days with 75 adults and 160 children participating. Visiting impact team expands staff's imagination with global stories and reports.

Internal: Order Youth impact House with musical program in sodality.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Big O Maneuver gathers momentum as supervisor of social studies for county schools says yes to four CYFs, county commissioner lends nod to TM, and Downtown Orlando Development Board is excited about presentation and considers sponsoring a cluster of TMs and LENS for community leaders. Maneuver frame is built, revealing that we have access to clout. Two Development proposals are sent in.

Internal: Ecclesiola on "The Simple Life" gives new insights into the life style of compassionate expenditure.

Contradiction: Taking quick advantage of current breakthroughs and carrying momentum through the holiday season to develop a strong record of achievement to lead into next saturation. (Wk. 9)

**CHICAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Development announces the acquiring of commitments for \$920,000 toward the million. The HDTS modules in Fifth City train 140 participants, including 71 Fifth citizens. Whole Nexus spruces up for one and a half day visit by USAID evaluators, who hope learnings are being written down, since ICA mode of operations is unique. North America HDTS brochure is designed and printed.

Internal: Bishop Mathews celebrates House Church, at which Debra Drown is received as intern.

Contradiction: Repositioning troops rapidly enough to handle shifting priorities. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: The significance of upcoming HDTS in January is felt with 125 people in attendance at HDTS modules on housing and welfare at Fifth City Community Center.

Internal: One new renter and two sojourners impact the Movement.

Contradiction: Thinking staff can relax after this week's major victories. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: Grand opening is held for Lorimor Community Development Corporation office. Five TMs are set up in first two hours of stronghold set-up phoning. Development continues to make major inroads into the economic establishment of Iowa through receipt of third major gift from Pioneer Seed, \$1000 from Super Value and a personal referral to John Deere and Company.

Internal: Visits from Geoff Nixon and Bruce Lamphere's uncle help enliven the week.

Contradiction: Turning awakenment and enthusiasm into commitment and regular engagement. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Earl Miner, designer of the TRAG truck and Smith, manufacturer of lawnmowers in Macksville, Kansas, introduce a new industry into the Cannonball HDP in North Dakota.

Internal: Mailing list is computerized so that nearly 10,000 TM participants and other contacts will now receive regular publication, called the *New Voice*.

Contradiction: Making concrete decisions so each shot is precise and critical. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Former TM coordinator of Long Prairie, Minnesota and school principal invites staff to conduct eight mini-TMs in eight 50-minute classes. Two hundred-forty students are presented with an awakening to the fact that nothing stands in the way of engagement in history.

Internal: Dunne continues to mystify and enable the metro cadre as it articulates the universality of man and his ways of explaining his experience.

Contradiction: Creating leadership during saturation and creating consensus with the local Project citizens at the same pace as opening government doors. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Major in kind victories total over \$600 with tables and chairs for Town Hall, five cases of paper, 25 loaves of bread, five cases of cider, community garden plowed, coal delivered and furnace repaired.

Internal: Community receives first barnwood deposit check.

Contradiction: Engaging the many people out there who are willing to help. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: House initiates two new TMs and does one other after "amen" had been said on maneuver, having gained insights on where short lead times work.

Internal: Financing miracle allows strike force to ride away in their new "golden chariot".

Contradiction: Getting comprehensive view worked into the nitty gritty without creating incongruous timeline. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Everyone is actually a Developer, as 350 phone calls, 30 appointments and 96 people contacted lead to achieving the bottom line target.

Internal: House sustains momentum through exceptional collegiums, decor and Day II time design.

Contradiction: Creating regional maneuver that propels into Quarter III. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Guild meetings at the Project office attract enthusiastic group for opening corporate session with conversation on other Project newspapers. Individual guild sessions make plans for pushing forward with current major projects, including after-school elementary get-togethers, winterization of a dozen homes with free government materials, ice skating rink on the town green area, and a woodshop to start early next year.

Internal: Two new Guardians from Boston join House for a weekend of roofing, cutting firewood for House use and great Saturday night celebration.

Contradiction: Expressing corporate power and guarding against dilution by immediacies. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Regional industrial plants supply support for saturation program in Halton Regional Municipality, a suburb of Toronto. Canadian ICA Board of Directors meeting is held in the House, and Toronto begins to take on focal point role as East and West begin to meet in Toronto.

Internal: A transition takes place in present House structures by creating a guild meeting on Thursdays and sodality as the format for the Saturday evening celebration.

Contradiction: Breaking open authorization concretions and network sponsorships in Halton Regional Municipality. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Development and authorization have a "true and beautiful" week as 26 out of 26 visits produce all requested, and sometimes more.

Internal: Internal life celebrations come alive with poetry reading in Saturday evening ecclesiola and birthday celebration, and guest night on Thursday.

Contradiction: Formulating troops in the course of the set up and preparation going on now. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DEL'ACADIE HDP**

External: Everyone is engaged as four combine Guardian Consult with research/marketing trip covering two nations, nine states, three provinces and three time zones. Six cabinetmakers take two-day trip to provincial furniture factories. Adult education center opens with two classrooms and a library.

Internal: The phoenix arises with the securing of a new three-bedroom furnished mobile home for nine months in kind and the birth of Dara Elise Stringham, seven and one half pounds, October 10th.

Contradiction: Getting immediate funds for programs which need short-term funding before winter comes, in the midst of long-term funding plan. (Wk. 6)

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Long-awaited water tank, which will finally enable delivery of water to the village, arrives and size awes us all.

Internal: Halloween is celebrated in the jungle with popcorn, candy and creepy stories.

Contradiction: Enabling community leaders to assume responsibility for the whole community. (Wk. 9)

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: The printed documents are received! Preschool expands with new staff and students and three classrooms. Project moves into accelerated phase of adult education with classes in tractor mechanics, guitar, and a new phase of sewing classes which includes the beginning of the sewing industry.

Internal: New auxiliary member, Julio Lopez, is welcomed.

Contradiction: Finding way to weave established leadership with young rising leadership into effective core. (Wk. 8)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Two hundred community residents attend first dance since the Consult. Health survey contacts 172 people. Site is found for the bakery. Training lessons in baking bread are given to two auxiliary. One hundred-fifty cucumber plants are sown, tomato plants are weeded, and mustard greens are sold in regional market. Preschoolers visit demonstration farm and see sugar cane processing. Development nets 25,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,250) from Pan American Foundation. Program books are submitted to accountant for certification. The first Latin American interchange report is launched.

Internal: Community dance is fantastic occasion for learning how to dance the Brazilian way.

Contradiction: Designing staff configurations to effectively execute impact programs, Project catalysis, Movement formation and support systems. (Wk. 9)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: After an exciting Week 4 in which the community bakery opened and the first demonstration irrigation project was installed in Conacaste, interest accelerates with the beginning of first local industry. One of three trainees in wicker making returns to begin local manufacture and the response is fantastic, working almost dawn to dusk with several new adults joining the work during the week. Donation of a typewriter enables writing of thank-you letters and more requests. A second pump offers possibility of another irrigation demonstration.

Internal: *Mesa Rodonda* (Round Table) and collegium become a regular part of the auxiliary's life, allowing all to catch up rapidly on the collective wisdom of the global Movement.

Contradiction: Developing funds for and/or inking transportation to enable full use of advantages given by victories to date. (Wk. 8)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that the Canadian High Commission is granting \$24,000 for Sungai Lui, while the Smith-Bell Corporation in the Philippines is giving \$7,000 for the HDTs. Chicago destroys the myth that you can't raise the money during Thanksgiving by banking \$232,000, including 3200 shares of Exxon selling at \$50 a share from an 83 year-old lady who attended the Salani Consult in Apia. Toward the Miraculous Million \$455,000 is banked, with another \$450,000 committed. The signal breakthrough for the Centrum is the receiving of our 35 CCA charitable status from the India Central Government. The key contradiction lies in the arena of continuing the momentum gained with the recent advantages all the way through closing the year and not "digging in".

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Bombay Nexus wins with redesigning Project Directors Training Module to meet needs of both new and old Project directors and producing a "fill-in-the-blank" consult workbook. New structures for the Emerging Generation, both in farm weekends in Chicago and Hong Kong Nexus, reflect growing significance of Phase One in the missional task. Global collegiums begin to forge common memory and concern around the world and reveal real key to indirect approach to the Third Campaign. The staffing by Research Centrum of 44-hour training event in Lorne, an embryo of the projected 10-day leadership lab, plus HDTs in three locations and HDTs module in Ivy City illuminates the call for practical implementation labs in every phase of Institute work. The key contradiction lies in the arena of effectively managing the researching and operating of three new training constructs.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Clancy Mann returns from India in time to do New York LENS for staff of Fund for Multinational Management Education. Two-day AID visit engages GSD post in dialogue on methods of evaluation and practical support systems. Uptown holds CYF and award TM, anticipating another four. Plains, Georgia has a fine TM. Work on Houston Pivot City maneuver welds resources of Development and Operations in the field and lays groundwork for effective programmatic framing. The key contradiction lies in the arena of Centrum field maneuvers in discerning contradictions which inform creation of common operational models and roles.

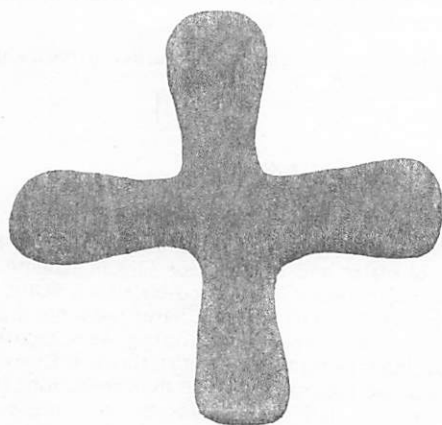
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Highlights include the practical experience of being part of a network of demonstration projects by local people and decision of Kath Sim to "wear the blue" and self-consciously care for women in Tai'rgwaith.

Internal: House attends *The Girlfriends* as part of ecclesiola and meet John Dunne with great anticipation of the study.

Contradiction: Building the whole bridge with only one fourth of the planks. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development letters are sent out in preparation for a two-week Glasgow blitz. Invitations for GWF and calling are greeted with great enthusiasm. Calling and clarifying awakenment strongholds in East and North Scotland continues.

Internal: Ecclesiola with colleagues contains refreshing highlight of Dunne's eye-opener on care, and poetry from around the world for sodality.

Contradiction: Securing the pre-Christmas victories to launch the second half of the year. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Leadership training expands with Community Management Board personnel on important visits and older youth assisting with TM workshops and orchestration, and doing CYF pedagogy in Isle of Dogs. Ifor Davis, MP agrees to sign and hand-deliver personal invitation to visit village from community leaders to George Thomas, Speaker of the House of Commons. Project brochure rough copy is prepared from global models, and duplicating machine is leased at 70% discount after good visit.

Internal: Automobile crash injures Meg Bochert, major Project authorization figure, and impacts auxiliary and village consciousness.

Internal: The USA festival of Thanksgiving is celebrated in England at the House.

Contradiction: Allowing traditional permeation images to deflect from the rest of the mission. (Wk. 10)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Week of Development opens contacts with religious orders in Paris. Slide show with 20 Oblate and Benedictine Sisters is highlighted with opening address given by Bishop Mathews.

Internal: The House is honored by an Indian curry dinner prepared by Bishop and Mrs. Mathews and gift of a bottle of wine from Cana, Israel.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum going on two fronts at once. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Fine TM is held in Sella di Corno, the saddle of the mountain peaks. CYF excites 25 young people in Rome, promising badly needed workshop leaders and circuiters.

Internal: Mary Woodbury is away for father's funeral in Canada.

Contradiction: Locating the young people who care. (Wk. 10)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Sewing factory foundation is dug by employees as Mr. Onofowokan, noted Nigerian architect, volunteers plan for whole industrial park. Fishermen's Guild requests revolving loan from industry and begins building flying boat, catalyzing high interest in guild activities and providing management for fish farm. Chicken house contractor is hired and land is cleared as farmers catalyze action. Development gets 1000 Nigerian pounds in-hand in Week 7. First pillows are delivered with new label.

Internal: House is reminded of contingency during fast and Hubert's witness after scorpion bite.

Contradiction: Expanding Nigerian responsibility and participation in human development. (Wk. 10)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The Guardians' event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakenment and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyshock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Twenty Guardians welcome Panchayat and actively participate in workshop on Dorpsdag, as well as volunteering time and offering hostelry. One more colleague joins circuit force.

Internal: Sr. Yvonne Guenec from France breaks open religious order facility possibilities in the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Operating out of contradiction-oriented, rather than goal-oriented, images of victory. (Wk. 7)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: TM team wars up for the schedule that will be necessary to do the zig by doing six TMs in one week and setting up eight new ones. Two Frankfurt pastors are confronted with the need to lead their people in their cadre participation. Both decide to shift their personal priorities to clear schedule for cadre meetings and expand their congregations' participation.

Internal: As Elizabeth and Tolman bring the Opel back from the Ruhr Valley squealing, grinding and smoking, Manfred shows the power of regular maintenance by taking the VW directly from a grueling week in Austria to another strenuous week in Hamburg and the North Sea communities.

Contradiction: Getting detached from last week's strategy to move to what is now revealed as necessary. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Fourth community TM in Kreuzberg Ost is held this week. Community people do the printing for the December issue of *Laterne*, monthly 16-page community newspaper. All permissions are gotten and stands are prepared for this coming Sunday's Christmas Street Market. Eight-week English course ends with gala celebration at American restaurant with all 20 people ordering in English.

Internal: Richard Maguire returns for Week II and tells exciting TM stories from Southern Germany.

Contradiction: Keeping the global story active to free the spirit from pharisee-ism. (Wk. 10)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Week of "Economic Groundwork" in Kapini HDP sees arrival of maize and fertilizer for 40-acre scheme, 100 farmers meeting to discuss starting a co-op, Kapini HDP Credit Union briefing attended by 130 enthusiastic residents, the first Lusaka Guardians' Meeting bringing new depth of commitment, letter from the President's Office to EEC verifying government support of the Kapini HDP, the distribution of seed packets to Kapini HDP families for home gardens, the graduation of 10 farm trainees and grand Independence Day celebration with iron men marching off to their stakes at 6:00 AM to plant new "freedom (notice) boards" in each stake node.

Internal: High level spirit spin on the "missing blue radio" and ecclesiola conversation on "The Enemy" lend humor and perspective to the contingencies of corporate living.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between the main road and the Project site before the rains set in. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Ninety-five children attend the first day of preschool, with another hundred "dropping in" for lunch. The ICA: Egypt Board of Directors is formed.

Internal: House whitewashes walls and decors entry space with green plants and Sadat quote, "I know I will not lose the Way, because my roots are in the village".

Contradiction: Finding ways to plan on the run. (Wk. 10)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Borehole pumps water for the first time at DUF. Comartka sells 710 Kenyan shillings worth of baskets on local market. New sub-tactic in Development wins at 100% with telephone calls for 200 Kenyan shillings. Health caretakers gather for first meeting with 11 present. District officials visit Kawangware and are pleased with what they see. Kawatex test their ability with samples of mattress covers and look forward to large contract. Appropriate Technology International proposal is submitted for economic undergirding of Kawangware. Great Village Meetings are held in Embakasi with 350 parents present. Farmers take a field trip to veterinary farm.

Internal: House attends the *Sting* (film) on Saturday night.

Contradiction: Demonstrating that this is the time and focusing all toward a winning visible sign. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP**

External: Progress on the Community Center is pushed forward with 90% completion of the roof, paving the way for re-establishing regular HDP headquarters in one week. Site visits increase on both a drop-in and scheduled basis, signalling the significance of Kamweleni administration of rural development for all of Kenya. Unsettled and partially constructed central building signals to visitors that demonstration can be underway in any conditions.

Internal: House welcomes Peter Malaba, temporary auxiliary until Continental Council, who immediately moves in to gun agriculture.

Contradiction: Catalyzing effective demonstration in the midst of troop and material shortages and facility disorganization. (Wk. 9)

**BOMBAY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: The three-hour Gram Sabha is launched causing great awakening events—three done in two days in Ratnagiri District.

Internal: First declared discontinuity is structured around Duvali celebration for six days.

Contradiction: Utilizing media tools to expand auxiliary's practical vision and planning. (Wk. 9)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Sikroar Supporters' Committee is initiated. Four thousand bricks are inkinded. Colleague letter is completed and mailed. Inkind letter and request list is completed. One hundred-eighteen of the 200 village families are surveyed. Two hundred-fifty villagers attend GSD slide show at the end of the workday on Saturday. Colleagues, the District Development Officer, and the Block Development Officer pledge their support.

Internal: A house is loaned to the auxiliary by the village.

Contradiction: Maintaining support systems in the face of the transition from the city to the village. (Wk. 10)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Buffer project site-selection team is sent out on two-week trek to Patna, Ranchi and Jamshedpur in Bihar State to secure company sponsorship and to site village.

Internal: House size is doubled in one day with the arrival of troops from Management, Operations and Development Centurms.

Contradiction: Getting practical systems into every House member's hands. (Wk. 10)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Nexus visits with young man from Adelaide who is keen to work in a Project for a period of time. He is also interested in going to India in December for one of the Consults there.

Internal: World grid is completed, made out of plywood and stained a dark tone to be the major focus of decor in the lounge.

Contradiction: Involving everyone, Emerging Generation and Youth included, in significant roles when most of the adults are on the road. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Home demonstration class is completed with a big celebration with assistant district officer and 100 community people in attendance for the awarding of prizes and great food sampling.

Internal: District officer invites House to join overnight hunting trip in Penimbawan.

Contradiction: Holding the community consensus while guild and stakes meet individually. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI**

External: In the midst of rain, 20 begin daily plowing of rice fields. Four sewing machines arrive to aid the tailoring course. The village truck used for the market is painted and repaired due to the inspector's report of it as "untidy". Tax exemption is in the last office. Good newspaper article appears. Key visit for the week is with Minister of Social Welfare. Site visits are hosted from Sabah government official, Sjamsul Backri, President of the Pudu Rotary, and three American students who climb the 400-foot Sungai Lui waterfall. Development deposits 1675 USD for the week.

Internal: Rich Michael's birthday is great occasion for staff and extended families and friends with balloons, games, prizes, and Mexican food.

Contradiction: Resymbolizing the broad village reconsensus. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Staff and villager visit tapioca chip factory and Indonesian People's Bank to collect information about government rice program. U.S. delegation to World Forestry visits Kelapa Dua. Nests are finished for second chicken house. Chickens begin laying with 30 eggs total in first five days. Maneuvers are planned for two months with 20 villagers participating in the planning. Philips Ralin Electronics shows videotape of the movie, *The Message*, to Kelapa Dua village and staff.

Internal: Udin, first Kelapa Dua villager, joins the staff.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with fantastic breakloose. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: Preschool teachers travel to district town to visit other preschool. Each child receives a clinic card to receive free medical care at the clinic. New sewing teacher begins second class for illiterate women and one for teacher training.

Internal: House caps off ecclesiola by learning traditional dance from Nias, and doing the bunny hop.

Contradiction: Broadening vision of long-range benefits of all programs to complete tactics. (Wk 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Intentionalized stake calling results in high attendance and enthusiasm at the Saturday night leadership meeting. A team of four health officials from Barindosi Clinic visits preschool, giving thorough examinations and then taking 15 children to the hospital for special care. Three villagers complete a two-week agriculture training course and are now involved in planning chicken industry.

Internal: Guardian businessman, Baharruddin, arrives in village early Sunday morning with two cars, providing the staff with a delightful Sunday outing in the mountains.

Contradiction: Organizing and timing continually to move the Project from where the villagers' passion lies. (Wk. 10)

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Nexus holds greatest Hong Kong GWF ever, with 30 local and expatriate women with lively participation across the table.

Internal: Aimee Hilliard reports on key breakthroughs in the Philippines.

Contradiction: Discerning the difference between "problem" and "contradiction" when presented with emergency demands. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Twenty-two are registered and 10 possible for GWF, including two company directors. Development nets 4,000 USD. Guardians attend village wedding. Children from all stakes attend film show.

Internal: House participates in two village wedding feast and Thanksgiving meal provided by Chinese and American colleagues.

Contradiction: Holding the village in a creative focus on foundation Development whilst awaiting response of joint venture partner to foundation proposals. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Report on industry search, given by two villagers at guild meeting of eighteen, elicits excitement over possibility of raising crocodiles and exporting their skins to Singapore. A long-awaited land application for a new community center is finally approved.

Internal: The whole auxiliary is invited to a neighbor's wedding feast and discovers the power of the stake dynamic as leftovers are served to the neighbors the next day.

Contradiction: Clarifying the conditions of the approval of the land for the new community center. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Largest single check (51,000 pesos) received in Philippines and largest amount ever deposited in one week mark Development efforts. Economic acceleration of Langub crafts, sewing and brick industries is done in Manila.

Internal: House holds celebration in honor of Madaan and Ruby Tribhuwan on way to HDTS.

Contradiction: Obtaining typewriters to deal with accumulating thank you notes. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Development trek in Taipei for Quarter II receives highly enthusiastic response from past company contributors. Thirty-nine visits in five days result in promises of NT\$571,000 (US\$15,861).

Internal: Visit to Hai Ou coordinates all maneuver arenas island-wide in preparation for TM campaign in Quarter III.

Contradiction: Keeping conscientious attention focused in all maneuver arenas simultaneously. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: ELC parents decide on new uniforms for students, this time paid for by parents. Buri production is highest ever, though the two managers are in the HDTS. CRAFT receives grant of 1,000 pesos to produce new product designs.

Internal: House welcomes Ruby and Madan Tribuhan from India to HDTS staff.

Contradiction: Deepening resolve in new HDP leaders that is already there, into I am the one. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Sewing industry delivers 50 kimonos for sale. Craft, sewing and brick marketing and research teams are sent to Manila. Land clearing begins for demonstration mountainside farm. Training Center construction picks up with new carpenters and in two days accomplishes what would have taken four weeks. A 2,000-gallon water tank is installed. Infant school expands to six infants and four voluntary teachers.

Internal: Key event is study of charting method and JWM paper.

Contradiction: Moving inventory capitalization for industries. (Wk. 10)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The Development team visits a company and finds that it is open to a proposal for money and manpower for conducting Town Meetings. This is an exciting breakthrough for involving Japanese in the Town Meeting program and opens possibilities of similar proposals and involvement. A successful HRM is held in the town of Kamisuwa.

Internal: A representative from the Hong Kong Nexus joins in the viewing and evaluating of a possible new house.

Contradiction: Maintaining Town Meeting as number one priority. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG II HDP**

External: The village treasury sign with Saemaul colors, red, green and yellow, is put up. Pastor's class breaks loose new vision of engaging the church. The villagers strategize use of clout to get mill registration.

Internal: Jeju House hosts John Dunne as study *The Way of All the Earth* at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Re-advising village hardship in building a comprehensive plan which moves concerns to practical do's. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: The region continues to turn gold as House holds three TMs in three days in the towns of Mine, Ogori and Matsuyama. The Ogori TM catalyzes two more future TMs with the help of local people there. House gets 35,000 yen (\$200) more in Development this week, bringing the quarter total to 238,000 yen (\$1300). House sees the Chamber of Commerce in Fukuoka City with colleague helper in preparation for major funding blitz in two weeks.

Internal: House prepares for Panchayat visit this week and celebrates Thanksgiving with turkey feast.

Contradiction: Organizing and following through to completion the task of this quarter. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Development push begins with the updating of old colleagues, LENS follow-up and "An Evening with the Panchayat" invitations. Kobe GWF is held with 30 people present, bringing new insights and confidence to the doing of the Forum.

Internal: A week of celebrations includes a celebrational House Church following the completion of the LENS seminar, a GWF complete celebration, a fantastic Thanksgiving Day with two guests present, and a Sukiaki party given to the House by the women's English class.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the excitement of the Panchayat visit and doing the daily tasks. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: GWF meeting with Sapporo church women sets date for GWF pedagogy. Michael Shaw is sent out on TM circuit and reports date set in November for Fukushima City. Mr. Tonosaki is sent out to Japan Guardians Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Oyubari House hosts 14 guests for informal evening on Saturday night; includes drop-in from Switzerland, making 24th nation to visit OHDP.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to Oyubari as a demonstration. (Wk. 5)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: CTC prospects break open with two young men ready to go, a Japanese aboriginal from Broome and a representative of the Perth Greek community. Mark Fensham from Melbourne drops around for the third time for briefing on working in Nava Gram Prayas.

Internal: Neil Rees and Jay Zahrt invite 35 school friends to House to celebrate their farewell from Perth with a swinging House party which attracts a few more unexpected guests to liven the show.

Contradiction: Releasing people from society's time and money bind that permeates the December-January period. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Speaking engagement with Melville High School students releases the possibility of at least one for India. Home Community Meeting in Badgingarra opens door for several more as saturation wagon gains speed.

Internal: Guardian car dealer lends car while he resurrects House's old one.

Contradiction: Strategizing the releasing activities for the next six weeks. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Ha'll's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Phase I of CMA: Victoria Campaign is completed as 12 state committee members say yes and Sir Reginald Sholl says yes to be Honorary Consultant.

Internal: Ecclesiola experiences "passing over" and "coming back" on Westgate Bridge opening day.

Contradiction: Getting House on death ground that will let it risk an unclear position into an unknown future. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: Visits to five cities in eight days take place for referrals from "heavy" economic sector, to four Federal Cabinet Ministers to set stage for "Year of Australia". Peter Derham, Director of large Melbourne company, writes three introductory letters on first-name basis to Cabinet, while two other Directors offer to come and introduce ICA to Cabinet.

In midst of ongoing work on garden, local funding and preparation for GWFs, House also prepares a great Thanksgiving feast for nearly 50 metro colleagues, resulting in great "external" versus "internal" celebration.

Internal: Accountability by families at Thanksgiving addresses all as Bailey's are reported on the first Area Suva circuit (in New Zealand), which reminds all to be thankful for the largest area in the world.

Contradiction: Journeying local people to the point where they have confidence to speak to anyone as needed. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: The first village guild meeting takes place on Saturday evening with all ages and titled people present. They give reports of the past week's activities, school playground equipment, drains, and seaside park. The guilds meet and plan the coming week's activities and assign themselves to particular tasks, naming the week "The Great Week of Hard Work."

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic is intensified at ecclesiola with Samoan dancing lessons, daily drop-in visits of community people and village leaders, and audience of children at House Church peeking through wall-less facility.

Contradiction: Starting the action without waiting for the "perfect" model. (Wk. 10)

Contradiction: Creating metro circuit implementaries to keep advantages alive and moving everywhere at once. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Current maneuvers produce three TMs each in one day. Visits to "grads" of first maneuver prove TM is indeed an awakening event.

Contradiction: Channeling excitements of holiday into program activity and unified action. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Development visit nets \$3,500 and great promises for Week 12. Thanksgiving is fine event with Wednesday evening dinner attended by 33 colleagues. Highlight is after-dinner impromptu singing of old and new songs. First newsletter of year gets printed.

Internal: House, along with Development team, enjoys Thanksgiving day at colleague Bob Springs' home.

Contradiction: Pulling together loose ends in all missional arenas before holiday fever sets in. (Wk. 10)

### **EDMONTON**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Colleague formation is the theme of the week, with four-page newsletter sent across region and three strategy sessions on saturation which elicit great responses from forum grads. One colleague is excited about attending Minto Consult and another about driving to Williams Lake GWF.

Internal: Another fine ecclesiola marks the end of the week of "record-income-making" as well as models for more jobs.

Contradiction: Enlivening the structures that release momentum for saturation. (Wk. 9)

Internal: House hosts guests, including Guardians from four states and several from Iowa.

Contradiction: Creating structures for broader guild engagement. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Earl Miner, designer of the TRAG truck and Smith, manufacturer of lawnmowers in Macksville, Kansas, introduce a new industry into the Cannonball HDP in North Dakota.

Internal: Mailing list is computerized so that nearly 10,000 TM participants and other contacts will now receive regular publication, called the *New Voice*.

Contradiction: Making concrete decisions so each shot is precise and critical. (Wk. 9)

Slide show at Chapel Hill UMC, which provided travel money for Joyce and Roger Williams, addresses a fine group of women with a serious possibility.

**Internal:** Area prior family visits and join House and long-time colleagues for reports on recent happenings and reflections on the future of the Order.

**Contradiction:** Closing the first stronghold and dealing with the 12-county spread of these three micros. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

**External:** New regional consciousness emerges as Cincinnati, Indianapolis and Cleveland Houses meet at Regional Council in Columbus.

**Internal:** All participate in preparation and celebration of fine Thanksgiving feast with almost a pie a piece.

**Contradiction:** Discerning metro care models to keep local and global priorities in perspective. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

**External:** Clinton County holds initial stronghold scheduling meeting by itself and decides to move in the direction of holding a Town Meeting in each school district. House and Development teams lead training event for 30 block club leaders in follow up of last year's stronghold.

**Internal:** House celebrates Thanksgiving with Cleveland House and colleagues, and does quarterly weatherization.

**Contradiction:** Framing major corporations and patrons. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

**External:** Regional Council writes report on Quarter II and shares tips on learnings and saturation successes.

**Internal:** Thanksgiving festivities attended by sixty are highlighted by conversations on thankfulness, family roots, and the Mayflower Compact.

**Contradiction:** Building the nine polis cadres into ten iron men each by June. (Wk. 10)

## **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

**External:** A conglomeration of House metro and centrum forces provide an eventful Development demonstration week which enables House to top \$6,000, with money in-hand, in the mail and committed.

**Internal:** Collegiums on Area New York Project directors meeting, LENS, and historical orders provide a window into the future which grounds the profound social mission of religious.

**Contradiction:** Creating systems on the consciousness that is not a blitz but a three-year long march. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

**External:** Non-grad who saw effects of TM on her community goes TM recruiting with House and closes the day with, "I like this kind of work and would like to do more."

**Internal:** Thanksgiving celebration of plenty is enabled by colleague's gift of a large turkey and by the spirit dynamic of team gifts.

**Contradiction:** Building the winning story for an every-town-in-the-county saturation maneuver. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

**External:** House travels to Charlotteville to participate in a regional Thanksgiving feast and work weekend, and discovers the Project in fantastic shape. Auxiliary house is warm and sparkling, and wood industry is well on the way.

**Internal:** John and Deann Lindstrom are sent out to become part of the auxiliary at Charlotteville.

**Contradiction:** Forming a realistic set-up plan which takes into account Day II and Week II troops to accomplish the missional goals. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

**External:** Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Profound Humanness in the form of event "happens" to Ivy City all week as three days of community Thanksgiving feast preparation peaks Tuesday night prior to Wednesday night feast, and unanticipated community residents join in to help create a fantastic regional celebration.

Internal: House breaks through the events of the week to the profoundness of celebration, shifting the focus from the event to the collegiality surrounding the event.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops and assigning generalship roles and tasks to ensure the victory. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Governor's office approves a \$30,000 proposal to provide jobs for 18 community youth and three auxiliary staff members.

Internal: Dramatic poetry reading becomes a surprising happening as D.H. Lawrence poem, "Him With His Tail in His Mouth", illumines Dunne reading.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between mundane details and tri-campaign maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Community Meeting in Edgemont (Harrisburg) is undaunted by finding the fire hall in use. Forty strong, they hold a great event in their small three-room community center with the workshop leader straddling the threshold between two packed rooms.

Internal: Local colleagues from the first Philadelphia city stronghold to be initiated in January start their funding for the 20 Community Meetings by framing their community for local givers.

Contradiction: Enabling local leaders to take responsibility for the whole from the initial planning to the follow-up. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Week II eventfulness is in a Morris County RS-I and Fund for Multi-National Education LENS seminar. Quarter's bottom line of \$6,000 is reached in two weeks.

Internal: Collegium by LENS faculty illuminates the profound social mission of the religious.

Contradiction: Creating the systems on the consciousness that House is not on a blitz but a three-year Long March. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Guild meetings at the Project office attract enthusiastic group for opening corporate session with conversation on other Project newspapers. Individual guild sessions make plans for pushing forward with current major projects, including after-school elementary get-togethers, winterization of a dozen homes with free government materials, ice skating rink on the town green area, and a woodshop to start early next year.

Internal: Two new Guardians from Boston join House for a weekend of roofing, cutting firewood for House use and great Saturday night celebration.

Contradiction: Expressing corporate power and guarding against dilution by immediacies. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Dates are set for first phase of Bridgeport saturation: six GCFs and six training sessions. Second TM is held. Over 25 are committed to CYF. Funding proposal passes first review favorably. House and strike force attend National Association of Neighborhoods conference.

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to be an exciting reflecting time, an odyssey that Dunne has brought on, and a fun time, too.

Contradiction: Ordering time and decor so that the criticality of the mission is not merely intellectually realized, but immediately impacts House and colleagues. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Firewood industry research hits the road with marketing trip to Long Island. Saturday workday yields significant progress on the entrance sign and Project office renovation.

Internal: Inkind blitz yields great food surprises and House is gifted with colleague visits and participation.

Contradiction: Focusing the loose ends to victorious culminating events. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Whittenton Community Forum kicks off Taunton, Massachusetts stronghold with 77 present. Result is addition of impetus to upcoming stronghold events as well as the set-up of a CYF with Whittenton youth.

Internal: Historical context for Thanksgiving feast hits home.

Contradiction: Moving past assembly to future events before assuring a major victory at the assembly to crown the stronghold. (Wk. 10)

## MONTREAL

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: A week of basic authorization signs includes a Canadian Institute of Cultural Affairs Board meeting, a presentation about GWF to 75 business and professional women, and the arrival of the French ICA brochure. First saturation stronghold assembly is held.

Internal: All assigned to the Montreal House are in the Montreal House for the first full week, just in time to catch the swirl of a GWF in central city.

Contradiction: Ensuring that next maneuver shoots rather than dribbles. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: The week is spent in local authorization and Development visits within the saturation stronghold. House receives first support from the economic structures as two regional companies promise \$400. A visit in Toronto to the Better Business Bureau ensures nod for work in response to queries. Three colleagues commit three days each week to work in the region.

Internal: Brenda Harris secures prestige job with Ontario Hydro, a crown corporation, at \$22,000 year.

Contradiction: Keeping back-up logistical support and research two steps ahead of field maneuver. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Development and authorization have a "true and beautiful" week as 26 out of 26 visits produce all requested, and sometimes more.

Internal: Internal life celebrations come alive with poetry reading in Saturday evening ecclesiola and birthday celebration, and guest night on Thursday.

Contradiction: Formulating troops in the course of the set up and preparation going on now. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Everyone is engaged as four combine Guardian Consult with research/marketing trip covering two nations, nine states, three provinces and three time zones. Six cabinetmakers take two-day trip to provincial furniture factories. Adult education center opens with two classrooms and a library.

Internal: The phoenix arises with the securing of a new three-bedroom furnished mobile home for nine months in kind and the birth of Dara Elise Stringham, seven and one half pounds, October 10th.

Contradiction: Getting immediate funds for programs which need short-term funding before winter comes, in the midst of long-term funding plan. (Wk. 6)

### CARACAS

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Hanging water tank with huge crane attracts sightseers on the same day of AID site visit which brings community together in luncheon and informal conversations.

Internal: Maneuvers are written and assignments implemented for five week countdown to the Latin American Continental Council, December 15.

Contradiction: Establishing lines of communication through entire community. (Wk. 10)

### BUENOS AIRES

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: In Ninos del Sol and Ppeschool new staff and reading laboratory are added. Health class and structures group schedule extra meeting times on their own initiative. Extension division of the Ministry of Agriculture promises help with technical assistance and materials for irrigation systems.

Internal: Group creates "House Beautiful" with bright paint and new doorway hangings.

Contradiction: Learning to wait without slowing down efforts. (Wk. 10)

### RIO DE JANEIRO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Two hundred community residents attend first dance since the Consult. Health survey contacts 172 people. Site is found for the bakery. Training lessons in baking bread are given to two auxiliary. One hundred-fifty cucumber plants are sown, tomato plants are weeded, and mustard greens are sold in regional market. Preschoolers visit demonstration farm and see sugar cane processing. Development nets 25,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,250) from Pan American Foundation. Program books are submitted to accountant for certification. The first Latin American interchange report is launched.

Internal: Community dance is fantastic occasion for learning how to dance the Brazilian way.

Contradiction: Designing staff configurations to effectively execute impact programs, Project catalysis, Movement formation and support systems. (Wk. 9)

### HAVANA

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

### MEXICO CITY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: The completion of 20-week report holds forth promise of intensified Development work with both Spanish and English-speaking targets, and gives some ideas for personal Christmas mailing.

Internal: Two external events, the corporate writing of the 20-week report, and a Saturday funding blitz by all auxiliary members, have unifying effect on the internal life of the group.

Contradiction: Changing community self-image from interested spectators to involved participants, through stake dynamics and work days. (Wk. 10)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports the halfway mark of the miraculous million has been broken with deposits of over \$500,000 as the Advent mailing is being shipped out. Montreal receives \$12,500 to make the Canadian account bulge. The "Incredible Hawks" are holding true to form as they call all their assigned Religious Hours. Briefs for economic plans of all the USA 12 HDPs are completed and being prepared to submit a proposal to EDA on December 15. Development finds that as the Miraculous Million Campaign increases in momentum, the symbols and charts take on a crucial sustaining role. The key contradiction lies in the arena of receiving the committed monies.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports Dunne study continues to blow the imagination of the Centrum Band. HDTs preparation in Fifth City, Ivy City one-day modules on living environment and industry, special auxiliary training event in Lorne de l'Acadie as well as HDTs Sudtonggan and Maliwada, push to new understanding of training. Two Phase I, Andy St. Clair and Eric Mann, are honored by city as in top five percent of math students in the nation. Discovery of Dunne's definition of Mystery—not as unintelligibility but inexhaustible intelligibility—throws Centrum into new orbit of relevant theology. The key contradiction lies in the arena of existential clarity that neither knowing nor doing exist in itself and being is the end product of joint intensification of both.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports impact breakloose with momentum building as former participants set up courses and Guardians become faculty. Framing and remaneuvering for impact acceleration takes place on the road as Centrum troops visit the field. "Packages" of impact courses occur more and more with GWF, CYF, RSI and LENS scheduled within the same location. GWF reports indicate more participant reaction in terms of continued engagement with ICA than in other impact events. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pulling together the impact breakloose learnings to discern the advantages for building Quarter III strategy.

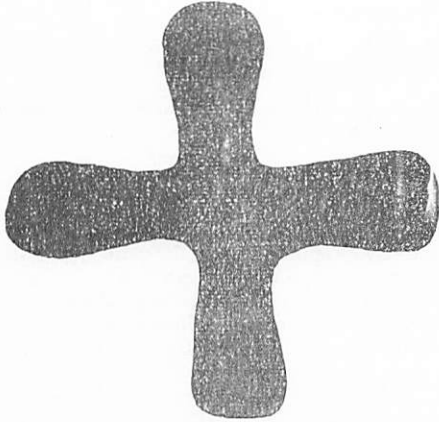
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: First Tai'rgwaith/Isle of Dogs Project interchange is actuated with weekend in Tai'rgwaith. Highlights include the practical experience of being part of a network of demonstration projects by local people and decision of Kath Sim to "wear the blue" and self-consciously care for women in Tai'rgwaith. Two GWFs and two CYFs are firm for London Metro Weeks 8-9. Framing continues with visits to YWCA and National Council of Women who give strong affirmation of work.

Internal: House attends *The Girlfriends* as part of ecclesiola and meet John Dunne with great anticipation of the study.

Contradiction: Building the whole bridge with only one fourth of the planks. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House holds an Evening at the Institute. A three-week Development blitz is launched. An anonymous town calls and requests a TM. TM document becomes required reading for a youth job program.

Internal: The ecclesiola continues to be effective as House gears for ten year celebration.

Contradiction: Continuing to check systems on the launching pad to insure effective take off. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Leadership training expands with Community Management Board personnel on important visits and older youth assisting with TM workshops and orchestration, and doing CYF pedagogy in Isle of Dogs. Ifor Davis, MP agrees to sign and hand-deliver personal invitation to visit village from community leaders to George Thomas, Speaker of the House of Commons. Project brochure rough copy is prepared from global models, and duplicating machine is leased at 70% discount after good visit.

Internal: Automobile crash injures Meg Bochert, major Project authorization figure, and impacts auxiliary and village consciousness.

"See, you yourself say to me, 'Make the people go on,' but you do not let me know who it is you will send with me. Yet you yourself have said, 'I know you by name and you have won my favor.' ### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: The youth of the region are moving on London. Four go from Manchester to London Saturday for CYF pedagogy, and two from Gateshead Robin Hood Gang plan for London CYF course next Thursday.

Internal: The USA festival of Thanksgiving is celebrated in England at the House.

Contradiction: Allowing traditional permeation images to deflect from the rest of the mission. (Wk. 10)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum Communautaire in Priest completes four of five departments in the Umousin Region. Development submits six proposals totalling 25,000 francs and ICA slide show demonstrates Guardian support.

Internal: House experiences the "pause that refreshes" as Alan gives three collegiums on his Maharashtra visit, Stan Gibson visits and Dominique Mathiot is sent out to gun the CYF pedagogy and forums.

Contradiction: Changing a flat tire with the car rolling. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Week of Development nets \$2,000 from religious orders in Rome.

Internal: The battle to keep warm is launched with an incredible kitchen celebration with popcorn, roasted chestnuts and readings from *Roots*.

Contradiction: Making the structures of Italian society aware of the death ground they are on. (Wk. 11)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Circuit returns from Kaduna to report two GWFs and one TM held. Three to five TMs are set up for next time along with one CYF and one GWF. Literacy course is being set up by December 15 by Ijede villager. Sewing factory shadow takes initiative in delivering pillows to marketing agent. Chicken house foundation is completed. Three lower echelon federal officials visit, expressing support in face of recent negative news article. "Barefoot Boys" request for interns is delivered to king and village headman.

Internal: The Global Assignments Commission college elicits response from village intern of "Send someone who is expert in making timelines," and conveys the spirit of Maneuver of the Void.

Contradiction: Flowing the money through the village fast enough to create belief that the village is developing, while creating maneuvers to care for registrations, services, visas, guilds and stakes. (Wk. 11)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The Guardians' event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakenment and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyslock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House completes metro coverage by holding Dorpsdag in Ter Aar. Zoon op Zand and Zeuenuizen.

Internal: December begins with chart of past quarter, new time design and Emerging Generation structures, initiation of month-long self-support maneuver and the House car breathing its last.

Contradiction: Deciding geographic and training priorities for January in order to inform December maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: TM team wars up for the schedule that will be necessary to do the zig by doing six TMs in one week and setting up eight new ones. Two Frankfurt pastors are confronted with the need to lead their people in their cadre participation. Both decide to shift their personal priorities to clear schedule for cadre meetings and expand their congregations' participation.

Internal: As Elizabeth and Tolman bring the Opel back from the Ruhr Valley squealing, grinding and smoking, Manfred shows the power of regular maintenance by taking the VW directly from a grueling week in Austria to another strenuous week in Hamburg and the North Sea communities.

Contradiction: Getting detached from last week's strategy to move to what is now revealed as necessary. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Fourth community TM in Kreuzberg Ost is held this week. Community people do the printing for the December issue of *Laterne*, monthly 16-page community newspaper. All permissions are gotten and stands are prepared for this coming Sunday's Christmas Street Market. Eight-week English course ends with gala celebration at American restaurant with all 20 people ordering in English.

Internal: Richard Maguire returns for Week II and tells exciting TM stories from Southern Germany.

Contradiction: Keeping the global story active to free the spirit from pharisee-ism. (Wk. 10)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Enthusiastic Kapini youth (12-20) gather for Saturday CYF and make plans for launching youth club. Three huge bulldozers transform Kapini HDP space as new roads, bridge and Kayosha River spillway are created just as rains begin. Five graduated farm trainees start five weeks of training in poultry at government farm. Commerce and industry push ahead as Guardian catalyzes new roofing industry, following successful research with flour bags and cement. Thirty bags of wool arrive for spinning industry, and general store is daily supplied with basic foodstuffs such as bread, sugar and milk. Community workday stumping at the primary school foundation is made easy with local songs.

Internal: Walter Nkana, commerce and industry gun, begins intern year.

Contradiction: Increasing community leadership and participation to keep up with Project development spiraling. (Wk. 11)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Ninety-five children attend the first day of preschool, with another hundred "dropping in" for lunch. The ICA: Egypt Board of Directors is formed.

Internal: House whitewashes walls and decors entry space with green plants and Sadat quote, "I know I will not lose the Way, because my roots are in the village".

Contradiction: Finding ways to plan on the run. (Wk. 10)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Donations for Project come flowing in this week with plywood for stake bulletin boards, 48 sheets iron roofing for goat house, and paint for signs. Stake night arrives with meetings in all five stakes after some stakes think that Wednesday is not a good night. Farrowing pen is ready at the Demonstration Urban Farm even before the piglets are born (the last time the pen was being prepared during the birthing). KAWATEX signs contract with Silent Night and Company for construction of 4,600 mattress covers at 1.75 Kenyan shillings each. Sports Club is registered, which now allows them to compete on a national scale in football. Guild meetings are a new reality as all discover ability to focus on crucial tasks and really use a timeline.

Internal: House experiences itself as part of global tribe and releases richness of cultures.

Contradiction: Identifying those things which have to be done to support what House has said it would do. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP**

External: Progress on the Community Center is pushed forward with 90% completion of the roof, paving the way for re-establishing regular HDP headquarters in one week. Site visits increase on both a drop-in and scheduled basis, signalling the significance of Kamweleni administration of rural development for all of Kenya. Unsettled and partially constructed central building signals to visitors that demonstration can be underway in any conditions.

Internal: House welcomes Peter Malaba, temporary auxiliary until Continental Council, who immediately moves in to gun agriculture.

Contradiction: Catalyzing effective demonstration in the midst of troop and material shortages and facility disorganization. (Wk. 9)

**BOMBAY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: The three-hour Gram Sabha is launched causing great awakenment events—three done in two days in Ratnagiri District.

Internal: First declared discontinuity is structured around Duvali celebration for six days.

Contradiction: Utilizing media tools to expand auxiliary's practical vision and planning. (Wk. 9)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Workday in Sikroar with 50 men and two tractors completes 150 more meters of road. Health survey does 160 of 200 village families. Status 35CCA (100% income tax deduction on ICA grants for the 25 district Projects) is granted by the government for Maharashtra. Inkind truck services are acquired for night use. A meeting of Embassy ladies hears about Sikroar Human Development Project.

Internal: Development Centrum, Jude Balm and J.S. Deth visit, and Thanksgiving dinner is held at Coe's, an American Guardian family.

Contradiction: Getting sponsorship of the Project by the private sector to allow a public sector symbolic nod. (Wk. 11)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: All Centurms active and scattered—Jakarta for Operations, Research in HDTs in the Philippines, Development in Malaysia, Indonesia and Australia, and Management in Singapore making payment on American Express bill, not in the mail but by hand on the due date.

Internal: David Rebstock's job, beginning the first week of December, is most adequate (expatriot salary) which then holds some support for the areas.

Contradiction: Implementing and then holding to full Day I and Day II structures that accomplish the timeline and support systems. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Village cooperative is revived after 13 years of no activity, preparing way for economic ventures to break loose with funding proposals.

Internal: Stranded Kampong and auxiliary experience "The Long March" with concrete experience of six-mile hike into nearest town due to no transport.

Contradiction: Maintaining village motivity in the midst of monsoon rains which delay delivery of needed materials for all programs. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI**

External: Sungai Lui is featured in the two-page centerfold of the Star daily newspaper. Article is entitled, "A Village Prospers." In addition, the Star decides to reprint 1000 ICA Quarterly Reports, which go out to all support and authorization figures. Two thousand Malaysian dollars is deposited this week. Visitors to the Project are representatives from the Australian High Commission, the German Embassy and the American Embassy. Speech at the Pudu Rotary gets published in full with a one-page inkind request list attached. Racun weed killer, commonly pronounced, "raccoon", is being purchased by villagers by quarts while the Kabota is busy in the rice fields. Most exciting event of the week is request from Stakes Four and Five to hold meetings again.

Internal: In two weeks, Peter Fuchs breaks old pattern of one job in ten years here in Malaysia with getting offer to teach German for the University of Malaya and also tuning up his guitar for an audition in the posh Regent.

Contradiction: Clarifying attitudes and responses while receiving confused information from many different levels. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Staff and villager visit tapioca chip factory and Indonesian People's Bank to collect information about government rice program. U.S. delegation to World Forestry visits Kelapa Dua. Nests are finished for second chicken house. Chickens begin laying with 30 eggs total in first five days. Maneuvers are planned for two months with 20 villagers participating in the planning.

Internal: Udin, first Kelapa Dua villager, joins the staff.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with fantastic breakloose. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: Completing six-week report reveals both deepening and broadening of trained leaders and a big change in village activity and appearance. Veterinarian trains three to do injections for new chicken industry. Sewing class measures 64 of 85 children for preschool uniforms. Farmers clear five coconut groves. Three duck farmers receive bank loans for expansion. Fish catch doubles for those with new Apollo nets. Work days begin village beautification by stakes. Savings increase through merchants savings-book plan.

Internal: Arrival of Andrew Jefferies from Australia and Rebstock from Singapore brings new insights for education programs and LEV formation, as well as manpower for auxiliary workday of leveling of land around the House and draining the swamp.

Contradiction: Filling in the gap between weekly maneuver planning and four-year Consult plan to maintain momentum and provide motivity to do the daily tasks. (Wk 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Intentionalized stake calling results in high attendance and enthusiasm at the Saturday night leadership meeting. A team of four health officials from Barindosi Clinic visits preschool, giving thorough examinations and then taking 15 children to the hospital for special care. Three villagers complete a two-week agriculture training course and are now involved in planning chicken industry.

Internal: Guardian businessman, Baharruddin, arrives in village early Sunday morning with two cars, providing the staff with a delightful Sunday outing in the mountains.

Contradiction: Organizing and timing continually to move the Project from where the villagers' passion lies. (Wk. 10)

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Nexus holds greatest Hong Kong GWF ever, with 30 local and expatriate women with lively participation across the table.

Internal: Aimee Hilliard reports on key breakthroughs in the Philippines.

Contradiction: Discerning the difference between "problem" and "contradiction" when presented with emergency demands. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: GWF, hosted by the Hong Kong Hilton Hotel, creates excitement among the Chinese, Indian, British and American women who participated. Enquiries about Consults in S.E. Asia and suggestions for Forums with local Chinese women mark the end of the day. While negotiations between the Nam Wai Foundation Ltd. and land development company continue. Flowers are planted and paths built in the village square. Young women continue work on the newsletter.

Internal: Aimee Hilliard arrives to teach GWF and in time to participate in the study of *The Way Of All The Earth*.

Contradiction: Retaining a vision of the economic future amidst the complexity of immediate practical steps. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4-H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Largest single check (51,000 pesos) received in Philippines and largest amount every deposited in one week mark Development efforts. Economic acceleration of Langub crafts, sewing and brick industries is done in Manila.

Internal: House holds celebration in honor of Madaan and Ruby Tribhuvan on way to HDTS.

Contradiction: Obtaining typewriters to deal with accumulating thank you notes. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Seventy-three Development calls in two weeks result in submitted proposals for US\$42,000 with US\$23,000 promised for 1978-79 and US\$2,777 banked. Two thousand TM workbooks arrive from printer.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast is celebrated with Development team from Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Laying out the concrete "do-ments" for the next six months after creating and rehearsing a winning story through Development visits. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: HDTS visits every house in Sudtonggan to check for tuberculosis as part of health module. Contracts are signed with Department of Social Service to pay salaries of directors of the new ELCs in two of the cluster villages. Tribuhans arrive from India, causing long discussions in village about who is the brown man.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with baked chicken, stuffing, homemade bread and squash pie, eating late at night after a workday.

Contradiction: Maintaining spirit practices that keep eyes on the thousand years. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Sewing industry delivers 50 kimonos for sale. Craft, sewing and brick marketing and research teams are sent to Manila. Land clearing begins for demonstration mountainside farm. Training Center construction picks up with new carpenters and in two days accomplishes what would have taken four weeks. A 2,000-gallon water tank is installed. Infant school expands to six infants and four voluntary teachers.

Internal: Key event is study of charting method and JWM paper.

Contradiction: Moving inventory capitalization for industries. (Wk. 10)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Three picturesque Sanya elders visit Nishimachi International School to receive a gift for Sanya of harvest foods, lovingly wrapped and given by the children. A three-hour workshop on Imaginal Education is held and warmly received by members of the Yokohama chapter of Parents Interested in Japanese Humanistic Education.

Internal: A House unit succeeds in locating another prospective home for Tokyo House, this time in Nipori.

Contradiction: Making framing calls without the needed leadership of established Japanese. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: The village leaders meeting with grand opening of re-engagement hits the road to re-accelerate the Project's kerosene station, bath house, preschool and common grain mill. Pastors' classes are sprinkling all over Jeju as 17 pastors from all over the city gather at one place. Kwang Yung Il supports sister Project, Kuh Du ERi, by providing a lot of medicines which would cost more than \$300.

Internal: Staff passport procedure makes breakthrough for deployment.

Contradiction: Maintaining the focus on the death ground that has been established in the village while being responsible to the Global Panchayat visit and Regional and Area Councils. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU ERI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The House hosts the Global Panchayat and holds a reception bringing together some colleagues to watch the global slide show narrated by Mary D'Souza. House has a fine guild meeting and trains colleagues, and then holds first Community Youth Forum in Fukuoka. Fifteen students come and share some enthusiastic commentary at the end. House receives word from Tokyo of 1,000,000 yen gift from Sandoz, and also submits a proposal to the Capuchians for 50,000 yen, as plan for next Development week and talk to major businesses in Fukuoka.

Internal: House members take in a concert, rejoice at new heaters, and celebrate the beginning of Advent and Sheri Zigenmier's 11th birthday.

Contradiction: Moving from single events per week to a multiplicity of events per week and sustaining momentum. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Panchayat visit brings great happenings to the region with open house where a slide show is seen and people gain greater insights into the work of ICA. Calls on Guardians net introductions for Development and incorporation. LENS date is set: February 2-4.

Internal: House has a fine ecclesiola with sodality led by 75-year-old Japanese dance teacher.

Contradiction: Taking on the whole month in one week. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: GWF meeting with Sapporo church women sets date for GWF pedagogy. Michael Shaw is sent out on TM circuit and reports date set in November for Fukushima City. Mr. Tonosaki is sent out to Japan Guardians Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Oyubari House hosts 14 guests for informal evening on Saturday night; includes drop-in from Switzerland, making 24th nation to visit OHDP.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to Oyubari as a demonstration. (Wk. 5)

## SYDNEY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: CTC prospects break open with two young men ready to go, a Japanese aboriginal from Broome and a representative of the Perth Greek community. Mark Fensham from Melbourne drops around for the third time for briefing on working in Nava Gram Prayas.

Internal: Neil Rees and Jay Zahrt invite 35 school friends to House to celebrate their farewell from Perth with a swinging House party which attracts a few more unexpected guests to liven the show.

Contradiction: Releasing people from society's time and money bind that permeates the December-January period. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Speaking engagement with Melville High School students releases the possibility of at least one for India. Home Community Meeting in Badgingarra opens door for several more as saturation wagon gains speed.

Internal: Guardian car dealer lends car while he resurrects House's old one.

Contradiction: Strategizing the releasing activities for the next six weeks. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: India and CTC luncheon is attended by 22: three decide to go to India for six months, two to CTC. Ten thousand Community Meeting brochures are inked. Biz-Jet is inked to fly nine to Murrin Bridge for site visit in January.

Internal: House hosts area prior and authorization Wedge team for two days to visit Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs, Andrew Peacock.

Contradiction: Getting the new Movement primed and ready to go on the road. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: Top level private sector open doors and accompany House to major victories with federal Ministers.

Internal: House experiences convergence of troops for planning in Canberra and then scattering.

Contradiction: Finding industrial base components for Murrin Bridge Human Development Project. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: In kind blitz nets 500 liters of petrol, Mazda tires and parts, and credit for wholesale buying of petrol on treks. CMA trek I takes off for one week and sets up three more CMAs while doing one.

Internal: Emphasis on self-support exhausts those who remain at home with overtime everywhere.

Contradiction: Finding tactics to immerse mindset in the rural. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: The poultry industry (eggs) is expanded again. In kind cement for the floor of the industrial shed is trucked to Murrin Bridge. Daily community sports activities include volleyball, badminton, tennis, soccer and football.

Internal: Two make trip to Canberra for planning and bring Vosler back with them.

Contradiction: Maturing and expanding the structures to work through issues and arenas of responsibility. (Wk. 10)

## **SUVA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Local GWF steering committee pulls off two fine Forums, only two weeks after their initial meeting. Circuit team in New Zealand reports crossing paths with a VIP who fondly remembered his ICA contacts in Kreuzberg Ost.

Internal: House re-maneuvers on key visibility strategy for the quarter—*Waanjonak Riturid* (demonstration neighborhood)—by seriously dealing with advantages and vulnerabilities in this maneuver.

Contradiction: Releasing local colleagues to use skills they already have, in intentional and timely ways. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: Demonstration drain acts as catalyst as several more are underway to eliminate standing water. Graduation of 14 district health workers (four from Salani) brings UNICEF, World Health Organization, district doctor and nurse to village, who then extend offer of cooperation. *Salani Voice* delivered to every home is the first village newspaper ever in Western Samoa.

Internal: Thanksgiving celebration extends the experience of sharing and caring as roast pork, crab and baked tuna arrive from community to add to more traditional foods like cranberry sauce, rolls and salad.

Contradiction: Deciding strategically where and how to push and when to retreat and regroup. (Wk. 11)

## **SAN FRANCISCO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: House holds meeting with colleagues from San Francisco with decision to launch saturation maneuver immediately in Mission, as signal response to recent events affecting San Francisco.

Internal: House recreates space by dismantling kitchen to increase office space and building new kitchen in basement.

Contradiction: Running for the saturation touchdown without looking back and being turned into a pillar of salt. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK**

External: First house for demolition is leveled. First two registrations and first contributions for Day Care Center (two \$50 checks are received).

Internal: Glorious Thanksgiving Day provides eye of rest and splendor in midst of hurricane of doing.

Contradiction: Pulling off Cusick celebrates (the six month celebration) as a true community celebration. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE SEATTLE**

External: House and Metro colleagues set-up and participate in three Development teams in three locations (45 appointments) raising \$6500 with regional target of \$18000 well in sight.

Internal: Everyone experiences being "in on" the whole thrust of Development detailed reporting, record keeping and communication in three locations.

Contradiction: Creating metro circuit implementaries to keep advantages alive and moving everywhere at once. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Current maneuvers produce three TMs each in one day. Visits to "grads" of first maneuver prove TM is indeed an awakening event.

Internal: A pause for ecclesiola in the midst of too much to do gives everyone a second wind.

Contradiction: Creating an image of how to do urban block TMs to release key strategy. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP**

External: Potluck Thanksgiving feast with entertainment and games draws 150 plus, filling community room to overflowing and providing an opportunity to experience the style of a formal meal.

Internal: The community Thanksgiving event allows the auxiliary to celebrate with other families in the community.

Contradiction: Exploding imaginations so that the creativity of the community sustains the momentum. (Wk. 10)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

Contradiction: Telling the ICA story strategically to overcome the unknowness block. (Wk. 11)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Day care staff creates beautiful space and food and hosts banquet for day care children and parents to celebrate its first year of service. Miracles continue as the pay phone which was promised to the community two years ago is installed in the security office.

Internal: House spends one evening looking for the holes that exist in the programs, creating maneuvers, and making an Advent wreath for the collegium room.

Contradiction: Enabling work to continue despite the missing troops and shortage of materials. (Wk. 11)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inked wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

## EDMONTON

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Colleague formation is the theme of the week, with four-page newsletter sent across region and three strategy sessions on saturation which elicit great responses from forum grads. One colleague is excited about attending Minto Consult and another about driving to Williams Lake GWF.

Internal: Another fine ecclesiola marks the end of the week of "record-income-making" as well as models for more jobs.

Contradiction: Enlivening the structures that release momentum for saturation. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Visit of Development team sees House thermometer rise to \$1400 and establishment of permanent files, tracking systems and grassroots mailing list of 500 people.

Internal: House celebrates Development breakthrough with local colleagues at \$100 meal donated by Keg and Cleaver restaurant.

Contradiction: Moving with power into new saturation in midst of financial squeeze. (Wk. 8)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Team returns from Fairbanks with The Minto Village Memorandum of Agreement. Team reports on Chamber of Commerce slideshow attended by representatives of state and federal government, CYF appoints for Week 9 with city high school principals, suggestions from Fairbanks mayor for seven viable industries in Minto, including markets, contacts to most major potential donors. Anchorage phone calls to colleagues produce six church slide shows and many offers to help with inked. House tasks and research.

Internal: Alaskan bounty provides a prime two-year buck moose nipped in the bud by a Volkswagon, butchered by nine House, six colleagues and one tutoring student, giving House 300 pounds of meat.

Internal: Forum teams pass each other in the dead of night, coming and going.

Internal: Richard Kaufman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Street signs are delivered and poles cut in preparation for next Saturday's workday. Tom Whitsett, Charlotte Graham and Del Stagner meet with health caretakers. CPR training is confirmed for next Saturday. Alex St. Clair and Kent Tomlinson are sent to CYF in Oklahoma City.

Contradiction: Setting pace at beginning of the week. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP**

External: Three workdays are held at once with great community participation. Stake meetings include many new people. Library books are carded and door is put on with two days of labor by one man.

Internal: House hosts six college students from Trinity who come for workday.

Contradiction: Completing maneuvers before Christmas holidays. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY**

External: House winds up one maneuver and begins another with Burkburnett TM (Cleburne, Texas) and mailing of quarter calendar to Oklahoma City metro colleagues.

Internal: The House completes facility set-up with opening of guest space in refurbished garage.

Contradiction: Welding all the troops and tasks into one thrust through structural continuity. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: The towns of Blum and Lillian both hold great Town Meetings. Development nets \$1400. Dallas cadre and House hold workshop to create the Dallas saturation maneuver, visit West Dallas to set up TM and North Haven Church to set up CYF.

Internal: House acquires 1975 Datsun, and Christmas tree and celebrates Dr. Adkinson's promotion with the Dallas Independent School District.

Contradiction: Quickening set up of events and lengthening vision and practical preparation. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: First stronghold of Town Meeting Mississippi: 200 is completed and report written. GWF in Governor's Mansion has 120 registered, with more coming in. Preschool teachers hold two dances and two fish fries to raise Title XX matching funds. Restaurant plumbing is completed and appliances installed for opening.

Internal: Pecan harvest in House backyard and shelling yields several pies and many sore fingers.

Contradiction: Securing funding to ensure preschool operation, TM Mississippi: 200, and restaurant renovation and operation for next full year. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: A trip to Baton Rouge finds cadre in full swing after a meeting with the Powells. In New Orleans a breakthrough is made with Protestant churches.

Internal: Ecclesiola is held on Friday night with a welcome to original cadre folk, Murlin Mayeur and Ruth Kloepfer.

Contradiction: Being corporate while working on five different arenas of mission. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Upper Arkansas River Valley maneuver team has week of TMs and CYF while home base team sets date with local United Methodist Church for global slide show and Evening at the Institute.

Internal: Permeator and Youth maintain Religious House dynamic in midst of flood, pestilence, new Advent decor and the birth of eight puppies.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional priorities while temptations to bask in the pleasures of the season are tapping on all shoulders. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Carter Country Call Maneuver ends with an assembly and TM in Plains, attended by all three key Plains families, regional colleagues and local volunteers. Visit from Operations and Gibson gives House a chance to look at remaneuvering with real situation.

Internal: Week is highlighted by ecclesiola and play, and a special Saturday night dress-up dinner.

Contradiction: Naming the one pivotal victory in the midst of the multiple demands on missional time. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: First experiment with saturation results in four events in Gibson HDP in five days with 75 adults and 160 children participating. Visiting impact team expands staff's imagination with global stories and reports.

Internal: Order Youth impact House with musical program in sodality.

Contradiction: Concretizing guild plans. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Two CYFs are set for Week 11 and arrangements made for six to eight more during January. Two TMs are held. One is a training event for local colleagues.

Internal: A find in kind celebration at the Ramada Inn serves as a send out for the Weygandt family after a splendid three and a half weeks in Florida.

Contradiction: Keeping up a winning pace while moving through the holidays with relays of new troops. (Wk. 11)

**CHICAGO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: HDTS modules on industry and living environment train 106 participants in Ivy City, with wide representation from the community, government, Baltimore and St. Louis. Facilities in Fifth City are readied for the HDTS by a painting task force equipped with 236 gallons of in kind paint. GWF is held at Lawrence House for women from Uptown agencies. Development passes the half-way mark in deposits toward the million.

Internal: Preparation for the North America Priors Council includes hanging of greens in the Nexus lobby.

Contradiction: Keeping the eyes of the global centrum bands on the grand strategies of the year. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: The significance of upcoming HDTS in January is felt with 125 people in attendance at HDTS modules on housing and welfare at Fifth City Community Center.

Internal: One new renter and two sojourners impact the Movement.

Contradiction: Thinking staff can relax after this week's major victories. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: Friday night Festival of Lights launches Christmas season with great success. Lights on 110-foot water tower, Snow King and Queen (senior citizens), a Christmas mall (flea market), and a procession down Main Street are highlights of the evening. Over 300 people participate even though it takes place during an ice storm. The *Des Moines Register* picks Lorimor for a December 24 special story on small town community Christmas celebrations. They will be in town several more times during the month. Three TMs are held near Lorimor, and \$3,000 is received from Hy Vee Foods.

Internal: Geoff Nixon has most successful Development week of the quarter (\$11,000 in hand) and picks up surplus desks for the Development office.

Contradiction: Using Christmas momentum to solidly launch next quarter. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Town Meetings, along with GWF and CYF, are set in 17 towns in four-county area.

Internal: House holds a packet party to prepare packets for the TM, with people drawing lines, tearing paper and collating.

Contradiction: Planning the logistics to do the stronghold along with the Development week. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Saturation in Eau Claire, Wisconsin gains wheels under it as appointments and meetings are set-up to do a saturation within the saturation, involving a mass of neighborhood Town Meetings in the city of 50,000.

Internal: Thanksgiving discontinuity and the news of the Jonestown murder—suicide bring metro back with new urgency for providing local man with tools to build his destiny.

Contradiction: Building rational strategies and objectives so assignments are done practically and symbolically on behalf of the total Movement. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: "Coal County Caper," the second saturation cluster, is set.

Internal: House visits Pink Panther and celebrates stronghold.

Contradiction: Releasing power of local leadership to catalyze other towns. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Varied recruitment tactics result in a cross-section of ten percent of the community for the first quarterly assembly, creating a substantial quarter plan.

Internal: David and Linda Zahrt arrive just in time to plug into first quarterly assembly.

Contradiction: Simplifying quarterly council's work so it becomes a watchword for next quarter. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: New possibilities crop up everywhere: FHA is ready to loan money for senior citizen housing, ex-hockey coach agrees to start a team this year, and elders programs are offered to Kinney as a result of a VISTA contact.

Internal: Thanksgiving celebration involves community people, permeation and personal friends.

Contradiction: Committing House and the core to build community consensus by taking dramatic initiative. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: House makes trip to region's HDP, Fifth City, to do enablement, participate in a CLC and participate in the preparation for the HDTS in January.

Internal: The House hosts the area priors and has the first sustained conversation and reflection on strongholds.

Contradiction: Enabling the abundance of the coming week to be self-conscious care rather than just one assignment after another. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: A full week swirls the three campaigns with an emphasis on formation as four good TMs are held in the "Top-of-the-State" stronghold. ICA spends a day consulting with the 12 youth service staff of the Marion County Extension office. Janice and Kip May show their Conacaste, Guatemala slides to 30 in Louisville. Four new colleagues attend the weekend Community Leadership Conference in Fifth City.

Internal: Advent '78 and purple impact House, while Dunne study provides new insight into the simple life.

Contradiction: Breaking loose participants for the HDTS in Fifth City. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Guardian Jay Antenen is sent out to Northeast Asia trek with the Global Panchayat. Human Resurgence Mission is held in Winchester, Kentucky.

Internal: Completed master file takes away all excuses for not being ready to put out the mailing, and second big mailing of the tri-metro interchange is ready for the printer.

Contradiction: Seeing through the blizzard of immediate implementaries to Quarter III maneuvers just ahead. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Clinton County holds initial stronghold scheduling meeting by itself and decides to move in the direction of holding a Town Meeting in each school district. House and Development teams lead training event for 30 block club leaders in follow up of last year's stronghold.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with Cleveland House and colleagues, and does quarterly weatherization.

Contradiction: Framing major corporations and patrons. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: GWF sponsored by women's circle of prominent black church nets 65 in attendance and two YWCA requests.

Internal: Truckload of staples from grocery chain provides delightful ambiguity of where to put it.

Contradiction: Motivating the magnificent million. (Wk. 11)

**NEW YORK**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: The newsletter, with a careful card system creation behind it, is sent to 800 people, as a launching into systematic care of a network of colleagues, moving beyond the blitz approach to CSF and framing.

Internal: House discovers itself as an enlivening center to those passing through.

Contradiction: Reaching consensus on regionally-held priorities far enough ahead to allow effective weekly allocation of human resources. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: House sets dates for GWF in Indiana and discovers three groups who ask about the possibility of adopting a village. Regional Council invitations are created, printed and mailed.

Internal: Anticipation of the Coming is intensified with frequent Advent rituals and songs.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on the advantages. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Final TM of stronghold maneuver takes place in great excitement as weather clears and allows citizens of Covert, New York, to see new possibility for their little town.

Internal: Maneuver writing prepares House to finish quarter in great flurry of preparations for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Creating troop configurations in or near stronghold areas to accomplish planned maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Profound Humanness in the form of event "happens" to Ivy City all week as three days of community Thanksgiving feast preparation peaks Tuesday night prior to Wednesday night feast, and unanticipated community residents join in to help create a fantastic regional celebration.

Internal: House breaks through the events of the week to the profoundness of celebration, shifting the focus from the event to the collegiality surrounding the event.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops and assigning generalship roles and tasks to ensure the victory. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Widen Open Tournament becomes a reality as team installs gas pipe, uniforms and trophies arrive, and eight teams are scheduled.

Internal: Two guests come to watch House do a play at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Discerning the doing of active waiting. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Local leadership decides their particular participation in funding for the events of next quarter, and act out the decision by meeting with the strike force the next day.

Internal: Long-time Indian colleague from Washington, D.C. visits and prepares an Indian feast for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Framing in the strongholds to ensure a broad funding base with local support and large donors. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: First New York Region newsletter to 800 people appropriates care for the turf as a covenant with colleagues in mission.

Internal: Forty-five bed hostelry filled with numerous passers-through illumines the enlivening role of the Religious House.

Contradiction: Reaching consensus on regional priorities far enough ahead to allow effective weekly allocation of human resources. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: First Starks' products go to market—900 wreaths delivered to New Jersey. Great area Guardians meeting sets up new cottage quilt industry. Christmas comes alive as Starks Trekkers after-school program starts up and VISTA workers return from training.

Internal: House finally settles into new location with beautiful Daily Office room, and completion of wood collection adds to firing the spirit.

Contradiction: Dealing with geometrically expanding demands of the Christmas season in order to secure victory of next quarter. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: GWF with 20 participants, mostly black is held at the University of Bridgeport. Participants are impacted by the methods and the staff (all local/regional) is impressed by the built-in follow-up: the training events already scheduled as part of the maneuver.

Internal: The House hosts Burna Dunn of the area strike force.

Contradiction: Having a powerful conclusion to one maneuver and really launching the next maneuver. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Key couple attends area Guardians meeting and is deeply excited by HDP workshop. Two residents attend TM assembly in Watkins Glen. Emergency meeting is called to deal with vandalism.

Internal: House celebrates full ecclesiola with sodality trip to Summit Rest for beer and pool.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in all arenas in the midst of defensive maneuvering to hold key advantages. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: City planner in the stronghold area attends his second forum and witnesses to the effectiveness of the first forum, stating that he will use the products of the community forums in his planning.

Internal: Collegium report on Area New York saturation releases new images of stronghold strategy for next quarter.

Contradiction: Covering the bases (three Saturday events) with assignments of effective leadership and support teams, while coordinating Development effort. (Wk. 11)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: New footholds in framing emerge with signal visit to government authorities in Ottawa, informative visit with permeator's "deep throat," and initial provincial government research. First GWF is held in Montreal Region.

Internal: Mid-course correction launches a week's potpourri of celebrative events: *Casablanca*, *Billy Jack*, global visitors, sojourner send-out, 16 inches of snow and possibility of rent-free facility.

Contradiction: Appropriating the respect the world is showing, rather than feeling like small boys. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: A visit with the senior regional planner in Halton area opens door for a public rider for the saturation, and future visit is set up. A meeting with Rev. Wilkes plans a series of CYFs with the church. Development Immortals go back to Chicago with \$113,000 raised. House raises \$300 more through Great Lake Wine Company.

Internal: House shows new style of work as self-support team washes dishes after church function.

Contradiction: Getting through the door now that the saturation foot is in it. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Three government agencies call to discuss ICA plans and how they can be of help with regard to saturation funding and HDP capitalization.

Internal: A proposal for a half million to employ sixty ICA staff and colleagues across Canada is submitted and most favorably received by the Secretary of State.

Contradiction: Prioritizing complex demands of Development, HDTS recruitment, self-support, saturation set-up and funding. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Saturation stronghold is set up in Dieppe and a foray into Guysborough, Nova Scotia, and Baie d'Espoir, Newfoundland, uncovers communities asking for HDPs in their villages. The cabinet makers report first complete set of cabinets installed and are asked for three more. Total sales for November total \$2,200.

Internal: Francis family announces "M" Francis will swell auxiliary staff come June.

Contradiction: Shifting responsibility to community leadership and finding ways to do it. (Wk. 11)

**CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: CYF campaign in Venezuela begins with Lebanese youth. US\$10,000 is received from local church which was fifty percent of total amount raised in one event. Ecumenical Institute tax exemption status is received for donations to EI.

Internal: Thanksgiving in Cano Negro includes representatives from three nations.

Contradiction: Creating the image of "movement" in midst of seasonal and election paralysis. (Wk. 11)

**BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Misereor approves additional small grant to pay off tractor loan. Art classes are begun and "ping-pong for a peso" helps recreation center to replace games and equipment. Visit to nearby greenhouse and help offered encourages group to think of a similar project to raise vegetables in the off-season.

Internal: Packards announce new baby is due in their family in July.

Contradiction: Stepping authorization which is in initiation stage while Project is in acceleration stage. (Wk. 11)

**RIO DE JANEIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Two hundred community residents attend first dance since the Consult. Health survey contacts 172 people. Site is found for the bakery. Training lessons in baking bread are given to two auxiliary. One hundred-fifty cucumber plants are sown, tomato plants are weeded, and mustard greens are sold in regional market. Preschoolers visit demonstration farm and see sugar cane processing. Development nets 25,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,250) from Pan American Foundation. Program books are submitted to accountant for certification. The first Latin American interchange report is launched.

Internal: Community dance is fantastic occasion for learning how to dance the Brazilian way.

Contradiction: Designing staff configurations to effectively execute impact programs, Project catalysis, Movement formation and support systems. (Wk. 9)

**HAVANA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: The completion of 20-week report holds forth promise of intensified Development work with both Spanish and English-speaking targets, and gives some ideas for personal Christmas mailing.

Internal: Two external events, the corporate writing of the 20-week report, and a Saturday funding blitz by all auxiliary members, have unifying effect on the internal life of the group.

Contradiction: Changing community self-image from interested spectators to involved participants, through stake dynamics and work days. (Wk. 10)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Canadian High Commission grants \$24,000 for Sungai Lui. Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church sends \$4,800. Anonymous gifts total \$10,500. Invitations are sent for North American Human Development Training School inauguration on December 15th in Fifth City. The key contradiction lies in the arena of focusing the corporate creativity on the extraordinary maneuvers for the last three weeks of 1978.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports North America Priors Council allows enthusiasm for Dunne and HDTS to be objectively disseminated and Phase I handiwork is featured in spectacular bazaar which completes \$1,000 contribution to the Miraculous Million. Quarter III ecclesiola manuals and study books are mailed. Curriculum work on HDTS and ITI involves all the Centrum and most of the Nexus in Chicago. Trip to Lorne de L'Acadie for special training event reveals broad new horizons of need and possibility for on-the-job training and updating common memory. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unanticipated interchange altering the timeliness of strategies and priorities.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports impact breakloose with momentum building as former participants set up courses and Guardians become faculty. Framing and remaneuvering for impact acceleration takes place on the road as Centrum troops visit the field. "Packages" of impact courses occur more and more with GWF, CYF, RSI and LENS scheduled within the same location. GWI reports indicate more participant reaction in terms of continued engagement with ICA than in other impact events. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pulling together the impact breakloose learnings to discern the advantages for building Quarter III strategy.

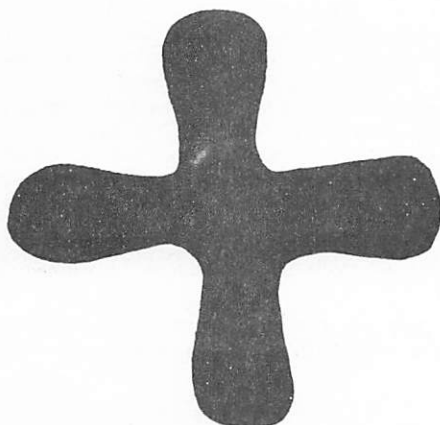
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Chicago goes into 24-hour printing blitz to prepare for Priors Council and wins on building prep in three Day IIs and one Day I. Brussels visits Ministry of Justice to establish residency requirements. Singapore prepares for USAID evaluation. The Centrum has won at establishing death ground to demand "super" use of time and troops. The key contradiction lies in the arena of breaking loose arenas for programs upcoming while continuing day-to-day support of mission.

Internal: Leslie Halford of Gateshead comes by on way to intern in Chicago. Tribal resettlement/public space redecor signals Religious House empowerment.

Contradiction: Keeping open society's image that everything stops in December. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: First Development call of three-week blitz nets 100 USD in hand with metro colleague participating while phoning to the Highlands grounds TM dates for "Aberdeen TM Jig."

Internal: Colleagues and House celebrate the tenth anniversary of Religious Houses on the first Sunday of Advent with a House gift of three brass candle holders.

Contradiction: Having specific wins in naming colleagues for Quarter III TM stronghold maneuvers and cash victories in hand during Christmas "good cheer at the office" blitz. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Leadership training expands with Community Management Board personnel on important visits and older youth assisting with TM workshops and orchestration, and doing CYF pedagogy in Isle of Dogs. Ifor Davis, MP agrees to sign and hand-deliver personal invitation to visit village from community leaders to George Thomas, Speaker of the House of Commons. Project brochure rough copy is prepared from global models, and duplicating machine is leased at 70% discount after good visit.

Internal: Automobile crash injures Meg Bochert, major Project authorization figure, and impacts auxiliary and village consciousness.

Contradiction: Focusing with precision as Christmas celebrations get underway. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum Communautaire in Priest completes four of five departments in the Umousin Region. Development submits six proposals totalling 25,000 francs and ICA slide show demonstrates Guardian support.

Internal: House experiences the "pause that refreshes" as Alan gives three collegiums on his Maharashtra visit, Stan Gibson visits and Dominique Mathiot is sent out to gun the CYF pedagogy and forums.

Contradiction: Changing a flat tire with the car rolling. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Week of Development nets \$2,000 from religious orders in Rome.

Internal: The battle to keep warm is launched with an incredible kitchen celebration with popcorn, roasted chestnuts and readings from *Roots*.

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Rev. Imams Afina and Alagha sign forms to take responsibility for registration of sewing factory. Five "Sons of Ijede" are interviewed for two new village jobs: streetlight electrician and sewing factory manager. First single focus Voice

is delivered, explaining the fish farm. Fishermen finish and launch new boat. GWF is held in Akure at the same time auxiliary men host Nelson Coar and Colby King, U.S. Treasury Project Inspectors, and Doug Martin, Embassy Economic Affairs attache'.

Internal: ICA Chairman Salami accepts his copy of the *Journal* with delight.

Contradiction: Re-linking the victories to the comprehensive plan of the Project in the consciousness of the village. (Wk. 12)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

Internal: The Guardians event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakening and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyslock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House completes metro coverage by holding Dorpsdag in Ter Aar, Zoon op Zand and Zeuenuizen

Internal: December begins with chart of past quarter, new time design and Emerging Generation structures. initiation of month-long self-support maneuver and the House car breathing its last.

Contradiction: Deciding geographic and training priorities for January in order to inform December maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Seven TMs this week bring total for November to 20—close to the pace needed to meet the year's objective. Target for Austria TMs for year 1978-79 are accomplished. Formulation team does individual visiting and deepens cadre commitments, resulting in greater participation in all three metro cadres.

Internal: TM team sees the possibility of completing the 216 Germany TMs, even with both Manfred and Hannah Golda going to spring Academy.

Contradiction: Participating in reflection that overcomes cynicism and crippling guilt. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: All troops focus energy on bringing off great Christmas Market with 80 stands, the U.S. Army and Police bands, and over 5,000 participants. Christmas trees and decorations are put up the length of Wrangelstrasse and Falkensteinstrasse in one night. Two community people go to Bonn on a four-day special national government invitation. Key politician promises 3,000 DM for community. The Lion's Club promises 3,500 DM for children's program. "All systems go" on community obtaining Wrangelstrasse 84 for new community center.

Internal: House totally participates in set up and clean up of Falkensteinstrasse Christmas Market and mans a number of stands.

Contradiction: Inventing the equivalent of Christmas Market, an event around which all tactics get done, for the coming quarter (Wk. 12)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Enthusiastic Kapini youth (12-20) gather for Saturday CYF and make plans for launching youth club. Three huge bulldozers transform Kapini HDP space as new roads, bridge and Kayosha River spillway are created just as rains begin. Five graduated farm trainees start five weeks of training in poultry at government farm. Commerce and industry push ahead as Guardian catalyzes new roofing industry, following successful research with flour bags and cement. Thirty bags of wool arrive for spinning industry, and general store is daily supplied with basic foodstuffs such as bread, sugar and milk. Community workday stomping at the primary school foundation is made easy with local songs.

Internal: Walter Nkana, commerce and industry gun, begins intern year.

Contradiction: Increasing community leadership and participation to keep up with Project development spiraling. (Wk. 11)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Ninety-five children attend the first day of preschool with another hundred "dropping in" for lunch. The ICA Egypt Board of Directors is formed.

Internal: House whitewashes walls and decors entry space with green plants and Sadat quote, "I know I will not lose the Wav, because my roots are in the village"

Contradiction: Finding ways to plan on the run. (Wk. 10)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: KAWATAX, the sewing industry, is launched with contract of mattress covers to be done in three weeks. Village tailors bring machines to industry as work begins. HCT weighs 28 babies in focus stake. Czech co-op representative visits Kawangware and is excited by Co-op and offended by mud. Fantastic hosting is done by Co-op Chairman, Charles Kimotho who particularly impresses the man with the scope of the Co-op and the role of the ICA. Farmers and Boivin spend day visiting the fish farm. Assistant Chief of Kawangware, Mr. Kibe, walks four miles with VM team to find he must recruit the meeting then brings tea and pork for celebration. In three workdays Stakes 4 and 5 put up bulletin boards and Stake 2 finishes new drainage ditch. Two light poles are inked for huge lamp that will light up the whole square and market.

Internal: Meg Wildhack returns to Kawangware as she awaits word from Kapini, her destination.

Contradiction: Enabling structures to build comprehensive models that implement timelines. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: One hundred turn up for work day and finish pouring concrete for one nursery floor and lay foundation for the Standard 4 class, ending with a cultural celebration in the newly finished community center with a feast of cabbages and harvest from the demonstration farm donated by the agriculture guild. Construction industry starts with 312 soil-cement blocks per day as the rabbit and poultry program and community kitchen put in their orders and shine in their new blue building industry uniforms. Farmers plant 600 gum and 500 jacalanda trees as rains keep pouring non-stop.

Internal: Kamweleni celebrates Thanksgiving with the Kawangware House in Kamweleni as the House moves into the completed community center on the same day.

Contradiction: Moving it without saying "no" to meet with the timeline. (Wk. 12)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Practically all troops are on the road: attending circuit meetings, enabling Consults; delivering materials, messages, and money; raising money; and coordinating the total effort.

Internal: House receives back from village visits and sends home the Iowa delegation and rejoices in the news of the birth of Jennifer Irene Yufamao.

Contradiction: Getting images in focus for January actuation campaign and machinery in place for the 2500. (Wk. 12)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghaziabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: All Centurms active and scattered—Jakarta for Operations, Research in HDS in the Philippines, Development in Malaysia, Indonesia and Australia, and Management in Singapore making payment on American Express bill, not in the mail but by hand on the due date.

Internal: David Rebstock's job, beginning the first week of December, is most adequate (expatriot salary) which then holds some support for the areas.

Contradiction: Implementing and then holding to full Day I and Day II structures that accomplish the timeline and support systems. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Community plans demonstration Community Forum (MTM) for district saturation.

Internal: House obtains first transport. Staff and villagers visit Dixie in hospital bringing news and presents.

Contradiction: Producing new economic visibility sign in order to keep hopes and dreams in village alive. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Friday is Muslim New Year and brings a surprise visit from Aisha Ghani, Minister of Social Welfare, the only woman cabinet member who asks the question, "Who do I need to speak to for more of these to be started?" Eleven thousand Malaysian dollars in receipts is submitted on the Canadian grant. President from Pernas, Plessey, visits and gets so excited he surveys village for suitable spot for orchid growing. Stake 4 decides to hold the first meeting in five months, but the big meeting is the Pasar Committee with 22 who discuss market expansion, electricity, kerosene franchise, a bank loan, and the competition from truck vendor who is underselling them.

Internal: As electricity bobs on and off during week, House sends out Michael Francis to Serusup with fried chicken and fries dinner.

Contradiction: Using sudden and surprisingly deepened authorization to complete the Sungai Lui Showpiece and launch Community Forum nation-wide. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Staff and villager visit tapioca chip factory and Indonesian People's Bank to collect information about government rice program. U.S. delegation to World Forestry visits Kelapa Dua. Nests are finished for second chicken house. Chickens begin laying with 30 eggs total in first five days. Maneuvers are planned for two months with 20 villagers participating in the planning. Philips Ralin Electronics shows videotape of the movie, *The Message*, to Kelapa Dua village and staff. USAID proposal rewrite is submitted. House receives Indonesian government letter of permission for Bontoa Project.

Internal: Udin is to join the staff.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with fantastic breakloose. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Pertemuan Masyarakat (assembly) was held to end Phase I of the Project with 300 people gathering to celebrate the completion of maneuvers. Stake name tags, games, health and industry booths, photo displays, and planning the guild maneuvers for Phase II highlight the afternoon which ends with an explosive talent show celebration in the evening.

Internal: Hasia and Mansur, new sojourners from Moros, provide a much needed translator and an encouraging spirit.

Contradiction: Finding ways to connect government services with the village needs. (Wk 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Intentionalized stake calling results in high attendance and enthusiasm at the Saturday night leadership meeting. A team of four health officials from Barindosi Clinic visits preschool, giving thorough examinations and then taking 15 children to the hospital for special care. Three villagers complete a two-week agriculture training course and are now involved in planning chicken industry.

Internal: Guardian businessman, Baharruddin, arrives in village early Sunday morning with two cars, providing the staff with a delightful Sunday outing in the mountains.

Contradiction: Organizing and timing continually to move the Project from where the villagers' passion lies. (Wk. 10)

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Sandoz gives 1,000,000 yen (5,000 USD) for second year in a row, and commits one person to work with GCF in Japan. Dow Chemical in Hong Kong gives first grant of \$2,500.

Internal: Dunne study pushes to new depths

Contradiction: Creating an image for the next two quarters that informs how to finish this one. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Supplementary education begins for secondary school students. Twenty volunteers build children's playground from rubbish in village. Mrs. Marion Lloyd visits with 22 people on way back from China to USA.

Internal: Reflection on House space as a demonstration is triggered by transfer of community library to temporary location in collegium room and by thorough cleaning of House.

Contradiction: Maintaining the significance of care for the social dynamic whilst all eyes are focused on the economic. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4-H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Largest single check (51,000 pesos) received in Philippines and largest amount every deposited in one week mark Development efforts. Economic acceleration of Langub crafts, sewing and brick industries is done in Manila.

Internal: House holds celebration in honor of Madaan and Ruby Tribhuwan on way to HDTS.

Contradiction: Obtaining typewriters to deal with accumulating thank you notes. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Seventy-three Development calls in two weeks result in submitted proposals for US\$42,000 with US\$23,000 promised for 1978-79 and US\$2,777 banked. Two thousand TM workbooks arrive from printer.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast is celebrated with Development team from Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Laying out the concrete "do-ments" for the next six months after creating and rehearsing a winning story through Development visits. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: The HDTS does one GWF, one CYF, and one ECF in three cluster villages after preparing all constructs and recruiting each event themselves. Sudtonggan Fiesta occasions beautification tactics—a flurry of construction and rehabilitation of houses. HDTS sponsors a dance for the Fiesta and puts on international program, demonstrating new corporateness among five cluster villages to themselves and Sudtonggan.

Internal: Guardian donates Advent wreath with two-foot high candles, along with mangrove Christmas tree which appears in every house here December 1st.

Contradiction: Transforming the enthusiasm of first two years into disciplined 20-year decision (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Sewing industry delivers 50 kimonos for sale. Craft sewing and brick marketing and research teams are sent to Manila. Land clearing begins for demonstration mountainside farm. Training Center construction picks up with new carpenters and in two days accomplishes what would have taken four weeks. A 2,000-gallon water tank is installed. Infant school expands to six infants and four voluntary teachers.

Internal: Key event is study of charting method and JWM paper

Contradiction: Moving inventory capitalization into industries (Wk 10)

### **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Three picturesque Sanya elders visit Nishimachi International School to receive a gift for Sanya of harvest foods, lovingly wrapped and given by the children. A three hour workshop on Imaginal Education is held and warmly received by members of the Yokohama chapter of Parents Interested in Japanese Humanistic Education

Internal: A House unit succeeds in locating another prospective home for Tokyo House, this time in Nipori

Contradiction: Making framing calls without the needed leadership of established Japanese (Wk 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Village Meeting signals re-engagement with plans by guilds. Mr Kim, Seoul (SAID) representative, visits and makes objective evaluation.

Internal: Kitchen is transformed amidst preparation for Panchayat visit

Contradiction: Practically injecting intentional momentum in village timeline. (Wk 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village bringing auxiliary back to full strength

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Bruce Donnelly from Global Development Centrum: Hong Kong launches House into new arenas of Development as over 50 companies are visited and introduced to the work of ICA. Four Japanese colleagues help call. Another TM in Kagoshima has 30 people present. In Kagoshima-Ken the search is continued for a second Japanese HDP village.

Internal: House starts new English jobs and continues study of Dunne.

Contradiction: Using what we have learned to plan maneuvers for the next two quarters. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Osaka meets the Japanese way as circuiter and metro circuiter arrive in Prefecture city to do a TM, only to learn they are being introduced to the people present who in turn are for the first time meeting each other. Development appointment with company results in a significant personal gift.

Internal: Unexpected back permeation money pulls permeation income up to date.

Contradiction: Building corporate power to effectively use forces and time to get all tasks done. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: GWF meeting with Sapporo church women sets date for GWF pedagogy. Michael Shaw is sent out on TM circuit and reports date set in November for Fukushima City. Mr. Tonosaki is sent out to Japan Guardians Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Oyubari House hosts 14 guests for informal evening on Saturday night; includes drop-in from Switzerland, making 24th nation to visit OHDP.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to Oyubari as a demonstration. (Wk. 5)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: CTC prospects break open with two young men ready to go, a Japanese aboriginal from Broome and a representative of the Perth Greek community. Mark Fensham from Melbourne drops around for the third time for briefing on working in Nava Gram Prayas.

Internal: Neil Rees and Jay Zahrt invite 35 school friends to House to celebrate their farewell from Perth with a swinging House party which attracts a few more unexpected guests to liven the show.

Contradiction: Releasing people from society's time and money bind that permeates the December-January period. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Speaking engagement with Melville High School students releases the possibility of at least one for India. Home Community Meeting in Badgingarra opens door for several more as saturation wagon gains speed.

Internal: Guardian car dealer lends car while he resurrects House's old one.

Contradiction: Strategizing the releasing activities for the next six weeks. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: India and CTC luncheon is attended by 22: three decide to go to India for six months, two to CTC. Ten thousand Community Meeting brochures are inkinded. Biz-Jet is inkinded to fly nine to Murrin Bridge for site visit in January.

Internal: House hosts area prior and authorization Wedge team for two days to visit Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs, Andrew Peacock.

Contradiction: Getting the new Movement primed and ready to go on the road. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: Sir Roger Darvall, Melbourne patron, takes authorization team to meet Andrew Peacock, Federal Cabinet Minister for Foreign Affairs. Sir Robert Crichton-Browne, treasurer for governing Liberal Party and influential company director, gives his support. Visit to Murrin Bridge begins new search for industrial breakthrough. Proposal writing for cabinet ministers continues full blast and ADAB (Australian Development Assistance Bureau), equivalent to CIDA or USAID, finds HDP.

Internal: Invitations go out for Canberra Christmas Guardians and patrons party.

Contradiction: Getting Murrin Bridge industry options in by Christmas. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: CMAs are held in Theodore and Howard, with three more set for the New Year. Christmas party invitations and newsletter are mailed. Development maneuver is built.

Internal: Marge Tomlinson arrives and leaves immediately on trek and House sends out Telfords to Murrin Bridge in the middle of the Northern trek.

Contradiction: Maintaining the three-pronged push of CMA, Development and self-support while troops are picked off one by one for other assignments. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: The poultry industry (eggs) is expanded again. Inkind cement for the floor of the industrial shed is trucked to Murrin Bridge. Daily community sports activities include volleyball, badminton, tennis, soccer and football.

Internal: Two make trip to Canberra for planning and bring Vosler back with them.

Contradiction: Maturing and expanding the structures to work through issues and arenas of responsibility. (Wk. 10)

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

Internal: House re-manuevers on key visibility strategy for the quarter—*Waanjonak Riturid* (demonstration neighborhood)—by seriously dealing with advantages and vulnerabilities in this maneuver.

Contradiction: Releasing local colleagues to use skills they already have, in intentional and timely ways. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: Village and Project timeline are seen as the same as manpower turns out for vegetable garden, school repairs, stake meetings and publishing newspaper.

Internal: Songfest at ecclesiola impacts House and guests with corporateness.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to see the cruciality of participation at every moment in the one task of building community care. (Wk. 12)

### **SAN FRANCISCO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: House holds meeting with colleagues from San Francisco with decision to launch saturation maneuver immediately in Mission, as signal response to recent events affecting San Francisco.

Internal: House recreates space by dismantling kitchen to increase office space and building new kitchen in basement.

Contradiction: Running for the saturation touchdown without looking back and being turned into a pillar of salt. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK**

External: All neighborhood meetings decide to decor town with community tree and some lights already up. A TM and a CYF are saturation events 11 and 12. House and entire community are impacted by the death of Theodore Stigall, respected community leader.

Contradiction: Grasping power in weekly guild and neighborhood tasks in the midst of community Christmas celebration. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE SEATTLE**

External: House and Metro colleagues set-up and participate in three Development teams in three locations (45 appointments) raising \$6500 with regional target of \$1800 well in sight.

Internal: Everyone experiences being "in on" the whole thrust of Development detailed reporting, record keeping and communication in three locations.

Contradiction: Creating metro circuit implementaries to keep advantages alive and moving everywhere at once. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: CYF proves to be challenging event for conciliation of youth gangs as six gang member participants sign up to be workshop leaders for their community's TM. Development

team's effort moves us closer to the \$6,000. International Institute TM with resettlement workers and counselors of Indochinese refugees creates powerful symbol of a boat moving from the dark to the light of freedom. Workshop training in Spanish and English reveals that a key role of the ICA in block meetings is to introduce community members to each other so they can work together.

Internal: House is filled to brim with extra troops to pull off week's events, including new CETA workers from Richgrove.

Contradiction: Transcending the political and ethnic tensions to allow impact to happen in the urban. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP**

External: Laundromat construction begins with all-volunteer force laying bricks daily. Plains are laid for picking up bull in mid-January. A playpark in Santa Cruz built out of tires and railroad ties has kids climbing over it before it's completed.

Internal: House sends out Raymond Lopez to Chicago Project priors meeting.

Contradiction: Finding ways for people to rebuild the history-long, self-motivating context. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY**

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

External: Montana Town Meeting Report makes its first public appearance at CYF presentations to Kiwanis Clubs and Kiwanis Key Clubs in Billings.

Internal: House enters Advent season with a traditional wreath at House Church and the December 6th St. Nicholas celebration with gifts for all.

Contradiction: Telling the ICA story strategically to overcome the unknowness block. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP**

External: Community sends Charles Lester to Pisinemo with a trash barro and Frank Brave Bull, Joe Two Bears and Richard Kroeger to Denver to visit regional offices and attend a Guardians' banquet. Joe, Richard and Amelia go to Chicago for Council. New employees hired through CETA brings in enough business to double the sales in the cafe and starts crafts lessons to keep people busy during the slow times.

Internal: House spends Saturday afternoon decorating for Christmas and putting up tree, then celebrates in the evening by baking cookies and listening to Christmas carols.

Contradiction: Creating the events to enable the community to put aside the enemies and envies of the past and embrace the demand of the future. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inked wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

**EDMONTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Colleague formation is the theme of the week, with four-page newsletter sent across region and three strategy sessions on saturation which elicit great responses from forum grads. One colleague is excited about attending Minto Consult and another about driving to Williams Lake GWF.

External: Trip to Juneau nets commitment of Governor's aide to be consultant and state funds to be available for the Minto HDP, while work in Anchorage nets two more consultant yeses, an M.D. and a communications man, one with \$200 of fee in hand, commitments of two loads of fresh produce inked for the Consult, and three church slide shows scheduled for January to raise money for Minto February move-in.

Internal: Send out of Roberts to Juneau and Priors' Council leaves House of three adults and three children to play host to volunteer doing regular work on House Development file, and a colleague couple, the Joneses, making the study of Dunne's *Parallel Lives*, a fine, impacting one with their spirited participation.

Contradiction: Guarding the spirit dynamic in the midst of dispersed troops and tasks. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON**

External: Interview with member of Social Science Curriculum Committee opens way for CYF in Saskatoon public schools. Old grad, Director of YWCA, suggests her program committee consider GWF for new year.

Internal: New self-support employment at week-end and baby-sitting by youth House member increase self-support total.

Contradiction: Communicating the depth human situation to people absorbed in dealing with "band-aid" solutions. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP**

External: Parklands saturation maneuver continues with five Community Forums, three of which are in small Metis communities similar to Vogar.

Internal: Forum teams pass each other in the dead of night, coming and going.

Contradiction: Creating stories and events which will enable Vogar to grasp itself as a Human Development Project on behalf of others. (Wk. 11)

**HOUSTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP**

External: Preparation for Fifth City event is underway as Economic Development Report is completed. A meeting is set next week in Indiahoma with EDA state director and two ASCOG (regional planning district) representatives.

Internal: House report for quarter at collegium illuminates new leverages and advantages unforeseen before.

Contradiction: Pushing to the forefront the cruciality of each maneuver. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP**

Internal: House hosts six college students from Trinity who come for workday.

External: Arkansas Upper River Valley stronghold is completed with nine events in nine days, including the first ECF with Dover, Arkansas, Chamber of Commerce. GWF in Mississippi Governor's mansion is attended by 130 powerful women from 36 Mississippi towns.

Internal: While recruiting HDTS, a new colleague is discovered in Nashville.

Contradiction: Bringing off the Mississippi TMs for next quarter while securing self-support. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Carter Country Call Maneuver ends with an assembly and TM in Plains, attended by all three key Plains families, regional colleagues and local volunteers. Visit from Operations and Gibson gives House a chance to look at remaneuvering with real situation

Internal: Week is highlighted by ecclesiola and play, and a special Saturday night dress-up dinner

Contradiction: Naming the one pivotal victory in midst of the multiple demands on missional time. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: Ruby-Mount Grodin TM set up in three hours has 36 in attendance. Key community black man James Harris, announces at Community Development Association meeting that he is attending the HDTS in Chicago.

Internal: The Powells are sent to Priors' Council with a CDA board meeting being called, along with ecclesiola which celebrates the birthday of a community woman for sodality.

Contradiction: Maintaining full speed ahead while not getting sucked up in the immediate race. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Two CYFs are set for Week 11 and arrangements made for six to eight more during January. Two TMs are held. One is a training event for local colleagues

Internal: A find in kind celebration at the Ramada Inn serves as a send out for the Weygandt family after a splendid three and half weeks in Florida.

Contradiction: Keeping up a winning pace while moving through the holidays with relays of new troops (Wk. 11)

### **CHICAGO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Nexus spruces up for HUD visit on North Side and West Side. Momentum gathers toward the HDTS as troops are deployed daily to Fifth City to work on curriculum and facility, and in kind brings in 220 more gallons of paint. The Local Industry Workbook is printed. TASC and EDGE financial projects are made. Two thousand participate in Uptown tree lighting and Christmas celebration.

Internal: The Ensinger family announce the arrival of four-

year-old Jordan Jong-Suk Ensinger on early Monday morning flight from Korea. Patricia Nicholas is received as an intern.

Contradiction: Removing the excuses that block effectivity, i.e., money, people and time. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: The significance of upcoming HDTS in January is felt with 125 people in attendance at HDTS modules on housing and welfare at Fifth City Community Center

Internal: One new renter and two sojourners impact the Movement.

Contradiction: Thinking staff can relax after this week's major victories. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: Friday night Festival of Lights launches Christmas season with great success. Lights on 110-foot water tower. Snow King and Queen (senior citizens), a Christmas mall (flea market), and a procession down Main Street are highlights of the evening. Over 300 people participate even though it takes place during an ice storm. The *Des Moines Register* picks Lorimor for a December 24 special story on small town community Christmas celebrations. They will be in town several more times during the month. Three TMs are held near Lorimor, and \$3,000 is received from Hy Vee Foods.

Internal: Geoff Nixon has most successful Development week of the quarter (\$11,000 in hand) and picks up surplus desks for the Development office

Contradiction: Using Christmas momentum to solidly launch next quarter (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

Internal: Development team brings spirit and vision in the midst of the one-week maneuver. Bill Salmon spends the week on Development and TM

Contradiction: Discovering the maneuvers which will break loose new orchestrators for Quarter III's six strongholds (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Development week consumes all in the House with raising monies as the Minneapolis Region Christmas gift to the world. Two thousand dollars is raised over and above the miraculous million bottom line of \$6,000.

Contradiction: Defining and placing ourselves on the death ground that will insure victories for the Kinney HDP and regional saturation. (Wk. 12)

Internal: House visits Pink Panther and celebrates stronghold.

Contradiction: Releasing power of local leadership to catalyze other towns. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Varied recruitment tactics result in a cross-section of ten percent of the community for the first quarterly assembly, creating a substantial quarter plan.

Internal: Completed master file takes away all excuses for not being ready to put out the mailing, and second big mailing of the tri-metro interchange is ready for the printer.

Contradiction: Seeing through the blizzard of immediate implementaries to Quarter III maneuvers just ahead. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

Internal: New York House embraces the Wayside Inn dynamic as 30 Guardians are hosted on Week II, followed by the hosting of 35 members of a Disarmament Conference, which provides a boost to self-support.

Contradiction: Recruiting people and designing a Council that enables the leap from the learnings of this quarter into a focused regional strategy for next quarter. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Hong Kong System is in use both for Development and Regional Council recruitment.

Internal: Study of *A Map of Time* enables clarity on the universality of being immediate, existential and historical beings.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between creating the colleague base and the immediacy of saturation goals. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Metro meetings in five metros target strongholds for rest of year and make assignments on tactics. Regional newsletter is printed on borrowed press and prepared for mailing to 2,000 TM participants.

Internal: Fire Department saves the day as fire consumes contents of one room and grounds contingency, space care and lots of other things.

Contradiction: Assuring troops to do CYF, ECF and GWF get to training event next weekend. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Profound Humanness in the form of event "happens" to Ivy City all week as three days of community Thanksgiving feast preparation peaks Tuesday night prior to Wednesday night feast, and unanticipated community residents join in to help create a fantastic regional celebration.

Internal: House breaks through the events of the week to the profoundness of celebration, shifting the focus from the event to the collegiality surrounding the event.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops and assigning generalship roles and tasks to ensure the victory. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Widen Open Tournament becomes a reality as team installs gas pipe, uniforms and trophies arrive, and eight teams are scheduled.

Internal: Two guests come to watch House do a play at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Discerning the doing of active waiting. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Philadelphia Metro meeting grows in size and consensus to have five events set preliminary to doing Development, catalyzing people into action.

Internal: Week II swirl of decor and newsletter creation, interspersed with readings from *The Milagro Beanfield War*, followed by a celebration, occasions a unique spirit happening.

Contradiction: Making Development visits a part of the holiday tradition. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Sixty people attend Forum in Parsipany, New Jersey.

Internal: Collegium on global Guardians reveals new images for acting out the role of guarding.

Contradiction: Recruiting people and designing a Council that enables the leap from the learnings of this quarter into a focused regional strategy for next quarter. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Fantastic Project meeting starts planning next quarter. First \$1,000 of local investment in firewood industry is committed.

Internal: Strike force gives report on state of the area and local party becomes strategy session for Fire Commission election.

Contradiction: Achieving Firewood Industry objectives in the face of local game-playing and approach of Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

Internal: House celebrates full ecclesiola with sodality trip to Summit Rest for beer and pool.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in all arenas in the midst of defensive maneuvering to hold key advantages. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: The first wave of the Taunton stronghold is completed and the receipt of a strong letter of authorization from the city planner, the Mayor's attendance at the Assembly, and a pledge are celebrated.

Internal: Cambridge resident, Rachel Freisecki, who joins House for an Afternoon at the Institute and House Church, turns out to be a colleague who has just returned from four months in Sol de Septiembre HDP and two months at Academy.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues from local turf to Starks for Regional Council where they can renew global vision. (Wk. 12)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: House focuses major attention on HDTs recruitment with side effect of good week in Development.

Internal: Five-sevenths of adult population of House attends

Continental Priors' Council in Chicago. Others celebrate with super sundaes and hamburgers. New part-time job in the executive suite of GENSTAR bolsters self-support.

Contradiction: Determining how to maximize the possibilities with chances to win in many different arenas. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Development push continues contacting regional businesses, private individuals and religious orders. Fr. Casper, after catch-up visit, promises January gift. Education and women's networks are contacted in preparation for saturation.

Internal: House prepares for Christmas, sends out Allen Balm, becomes Wayside Inn for Montreal House and sends representatives to Continental Priors Council.

Contradiction: Catalyzing networks to take saturation as their own program. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Three government agencies call to discuss ICA plans and how they can be of help with regard to saturation funding and HDP capitalization.

Internal: A proposal for a half million to employ sixty ICA staff and colleagues across Canada is submitted and most favorably received by the Secretary of State.

**CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: CYF campaign in Venezuela begins with Lebanese youth. US\$10,000 is received from local church which was fifty percent of total amount raised in one event. Ecumenical Institute tax exemption status is received for donations to EI

Internal: Thanksgiving in Cano Negro includes representatives from three nations.

Contradiction: Creating the image of "move it" in midst of seasonal and election paralysis. (Wk. 11)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports four major corporation gifts were received in Hong Kong and include Sandoz Corporation, Dow Chemical, Apex and Pam Macomber's boss. Singapore reports 75% of Quarter II targets in the bank. Tax exempt status in India releases 10,000,000 rupees from senior bank executive's client. Breakthroughs in government funding are reported from all centruns. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining the tension of achieving the victory while allowing everyone to participate in the win.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports spectacular bazaar which completes \$1,000 contribution to the Miraculous Million. Quarter III ecclesiola manuals and study books are mailed. Curriculum work on HDTS and ITI involves all the Centrum and most of the Nexus in Chicago. Trip to Lorne de L'Acadie for special training event reveals broad new horizons of need and possibility for on-the-job training and updating common memory. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unanticipated interchange altering the timeliness of strategies and priorities.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports events around the world bringing more of the world into programs. Osaka LENS results in request for another in February. Visits in Chicago in one week of Economic Development Administration and HUD dignitaries put programs in spotlight as agencies say "show us how you do it." The public face is put on every day as meeting authorization and funding sources becomes part of the normal operation. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining a global strategy in the midst of program possibilities while meeting all the demands that are made.

## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum reports a big demand for management skills/systems during Chicago's module II as local community management systems curriculum is prepared for the HDTS, EDGE/TASC consultation for year "in the black" operation is held, Martha Talbott trains for Order finance and a \$28,000 HDTS budget is created. Hong Kong reports all visa renewals secured, house accounts completed and rejoicing begins over Jeanette Stanfield assignment. Singapore reports ICA books up-to-date and Apia, ready to relate to Management Centrum: Singapore. Latin America Continental Council re-emphasizes the power of coroporate action, both in budget building and in creatively moving on the contradiction. The key contradiction lies in the arena of structuring the systems which allow for responsible care.

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Two hundred community residents attend first dance since the Consult. Health survey contacts 172 people. Site is found for the bakery. Training lessons in baking bread are given to two auxiliary. One hundred-fifty cucumber plants are sown, tomato plants are weeded, and mustard greens are sold in regional market. Preschoolers visit demonstration farm and see sugar cane processing. Development nets 25,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,250) from Pan American Foundation. Program books are submitted to accountant for certification. The first Latin American interchange report is launched.

Internal: Community dance is fantastic occasion for learning how to dance the Brazilian way.

Contradiction: Designing staff configurations to effectively execute impact programs, Project catalysis, Movement formation and support systems. (Wk. 9)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: First all-community workday turns out 19 farmers to dig community well and enough teenagers to paint the preschool. Farmers decide dates for two more workdays.

Internal: Rose West returns, bringing self-support funds. *Mesa Redonda* (Round Table) produces stores of five great Guatemalans for names of sector groups.

Contradiction: Using corporate structures to engage community troops who keep emerging ready to act out their care. (Wk. 12)
