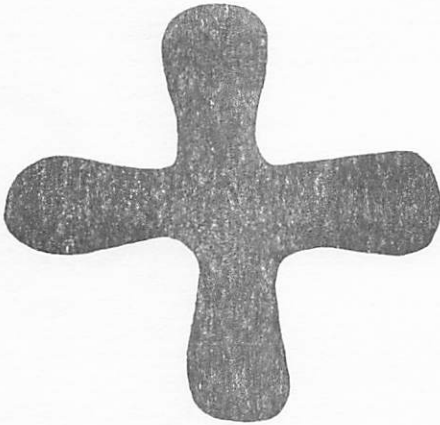

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Texaco donates \$1,000 explicitly indicated "no string attached." Bulk community store is initiated by seven founders. Building surveyors (architects) visit Powerhouse to help with renovation drawings for J.C.P. workers.

Internal: Three new Isle of Dogs songs soar to Tops-of-the-pops.

Contradiction: Finding ways to keep the urgency of February as death ground for the Year of the U.K. before all. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Government official in Tayside Region, one of Scotland's nine regions, sits down and personally retargets TM list of 54 towns. Top-down authorization is secured from political, economic and cultural sectors signalled by local Labour and Conservative and Scots Nationalist party members writing endorsement letters.

Internal: Town Meeting "Tartan Swirl" is symbolically launched with the gathering of 11 colleagues from Dundee and Edinburgh coming to Glasgow to celebrate Robbie Burn's Night, the annual Scottish festival, with the traditional address to the Haggis, Highland dancing and a global rendering of the "Immortal Memory" by pulling Burn's spirit journey through the Other World categories.

Contradiction: Building momentum in the southern flank so that all of Scotland becomes yellow. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Rally Day with the communities who held TMs in Wales November and December results in "yes, continue this worthwhile project."

Internal: With the presence of the Panchayat trek, the House enjoys hearing "first hand" of Africa, India and USA.

Contradiction: Hammering out a screen which is responsible to the local in a global context. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Newcastle youth group pledges one pound a day for three years (2,000 US). Institute receives invitation to assist leadership of Roman Catholic conference of 200 clergy and religious.

Internal: House sends out Lucy Smith to areal assignment to Isle of Dogs for quarter as Carroll Smith returns after carrying Wales report to area councils in Paris and Frankfurt.

Contradiction: Articulating the victory before getting lost in the smoke of the battle. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forty-five people at the Forum ommunautaire in Epinay-sur-Odon, a farming community of 350 people in Normandie, keep right on working without a pause when, in the middle of the Challenges Workshop, a storm blows out the electricity and the Forum has to be completed by candlelight.

Internal: The first Forum Communautaire document to be produced in France (Epinay-sur-Odon) is presented to the House amidst a celebrative Saturday lunch and is followed by the regular Saturday Open House in which we meet three great new contacts.

Contradiction: Clarifying priorities for the next circuits. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The week begins with a Christmas Eve youth dance, a huge bonfire in the Piazza and midnight mass and ends with a victorious New Year's Eve dance. Community leadership decides to take on responsibility for the project at midweek Comitato meeting.

Internal: Experience of discontinuity at a time in which even more happens than usual as visitors from Paris and Rome spend time in Termine.

Contradiction: Pushing against the Italian trend of away from villages by deciding to do rural communities. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Wedge, health acceleration team and GWF staff arrive all within two days of each other to impact Ijede and Nigeria. Onitsha GWF with 222 women from across eastern Nigeria opens still more possibilities. Ijede GWF with 22 includes new faces and honors old. Health Fair gives coordinators a chance to show off accomplishments and skills. A 52.5 kv generator for industrial use is delivered. Rice and vegetables are planted.

Internal: Two weeks of non-stop masquerades inundate House with Nigerian culture. Tajudeen Ogunbiyi returns from Maliwada HDTs and Europe development.

Contradiction: Dealing with the ongoing contradictions amidst visitors, cultural celebrations and special emphasis programming. (Wk. 5)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Dispersement of Nexus troops in one week to Nigeria, Egypt, Austria, Wales and Switzerland marks a week as usual.

Internal: House feasts on collegiums on Urban Health Trek, revealing its use as stake set-up, and report from Maliwada HDTs via Tajudeen Ogunbiyi witnessing to the school as a globalizing event.

Contradiction: Maintaining rationality amidst constant newness. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Visit to national farmers' union gives support to Dorpsday across the country. Circuits focusing on Belgian Limberg and Dutch Limberg constantly open doors, using American/Dutch team and American/Indonesian team.

Internal: House hosts Pieter Borms and his family from Borgloon as well as a group interested in working in GSDs.

Contradiction: Overcoming the mindset which says it takes six months to set up a village event. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House submits proposals to Heineken and Delta-Lloyd for Dorpsday funding. TM circuits cross Belgian border into Dutch Limburg.

Internal: With everyone else in Belgium, the two remaining souls celebrate a fine ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and streamlining practices in a time of scatteredness. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Vienna LENS is confirmed. Munich LENS is projected and Frankfurt GWF is set. Berlin participates in Ruhr Valley maneuver as three TMs and three HRMs are set.

Internal: Friends of Frankfurt House begin series of regular meetings focused on village development.

Contradiction: Creating a command center dynamic when nobody is home. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Project planning weekend organizes the economic and social into six task forces of five people. Immediately

after, work commences by recruiting 25 in four days for three English courses while writing the curriculum. A team of ten young social workers visiting homes in Kreuzberg Ost visit ICA office after hearing about the KHDP.

Internal: Profound Humanness spins, the China Report and historical sketches from Germany's and Berlin's past make collegiums sparkle. While doing TM circuiting in West Germany, Rich Michael has a reunion with relatives he has never seen before.

Contradiction: Covering the millions of details that make the difference between winning and losing the quarter. (Wk. 5)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Bishop James Mathews and team visit Zambia. Great meeting with His Excellency President K. Kaunda secures blessings on HDP in Zambia. Chief Mungule welcomes village site visits in his area, same location of village GWF. Bishop Mathews and Dr. Peseke are honored guests at LENS/GWF follow-up reception. Four grads say yes in four hours for one year in HDP. Development and authorization visits flood the Bishop's week.

Internal: Of four sojourners in blue in House during discontinuity, one stays for intern year.

Contradiction: Nailing down the last corner of authorization rug in preparation for going to new HDP site. (Wk. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad Trade Fair draws 50 visitors from Cairo, including British ambassador's wife and adding to 100 Jesuit school students already in Bayad for three days of work and 16 architecture students who do sketches of future plaza. Highly profitable marmalade industry makes first sales. Seventy-five all drims plus transport and wood for fish farm is inkinded, as well as four cages are prepared for floating in the Nile. Beautiful brick samples are taken by village employee for testing. Experimental plot in the desert is irrigated and planted. Bayad market opens. Guest flat is inkinded in CAIRO. GCF Egypt is launched with great demonstration village visit in Bayad.

Internal: Global Wedge team visits and spins House into practical grasp of maneuvering with overfilled table at every meal, including strong village presence with three new interns.

Contradiction: Creating the structural forms to allow Project acceleration to continue. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Five Village Meetings are held during discontinuity. Front running village for new project passes all tests to date with fantastic Village Meeting, authorization and receptivity. Four out of five Village Meetings add new yellow to Kenya map; Director General of Muslim Council wants VM in every Muslim village in Kenya and they will pay. Unexpected K.Shs. 21,000 arrives in mail.

Internal: First trainee to be sponsored by the Muslim Council arrives at project with suitcase in hand.

Contradiction: Taking anxieties about imminent shifts as motivation rather than paralysis. (Wk. 2).

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: Press reporters visit at instigation of State Bank of India. Guardian hosts two demonstration visits. Largest Continental Council held with a total of 314 assigned to Nava Gram Prayas as HDTS graduates 114 students-largest yet. Preschool Training Module begins in Maliwada for 10 days.

Internal: Health Acceleration Team sent out to Vaviharsh Health Training Module.

Contradiction: Aligning auxiliary and village in preparing for Quarter III battleplanning. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: City Bank runs quarter page advertisement highlighting Maliwada project in major India papers. Tata's Taj Mahal H made the first installment on Chikhale sponsorship. House meets the vice-president of the Century Rayons who shows keen interest in sponsoring a village.

Internal: Christmas Eve was celebrated with which treats thirty-one souls to the finest Keraliti feast, exchange of gifts, carol singing and the arrival of Hemalatha J and Kavitha from Calcutta.

Contradiction: Establishing the interior modes for Ashram Operations which will enable devising the service structures to meet the needs of the explosion of Nava Gram Prayas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: In village shramdam, preschool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: House sends Marie Paul out to Agra for the pump and completes more work on U.S. AID. Delhi House initiative results in Newzland rupees 21,000.

Internal: Global team visits India.

Contradiction: Winning with half the adults out for two months. (Wk. 5)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First trip of the year is to Jamshedpur, center of Tata, one of the biggest engineering complexes in India. Inkind travel for the trip augers well for village project support in eastern India. Participants leave for the new Training School in Maliwada, 36 hours train journey away.

Internal: New station and commission assignments take effect and give concrete form to the new year as job-hunting continues.

Contradiction: Ensuring each activity is effectively related to the comprehensive and the necessary deed, using maneuver and other movemental screens. (Wk. 2).

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House sends Ken and Peggy Wiltse together with Miriam Rumps (Peggy's mother) on Management trek to Kelapa Dua to build structure for Indonesian visibility and complete area GCF maneuver model for Area Singapore.

Internal: House finally completes tribal resettlement with moving of the men and women's dorm.

Contradiction: Acting to resolve the doubt that theory cannot solve. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: GCF task force does back-up and planning for major campaign in Southeast Asia. Sarawak State Development officer submits HDP proposal to deputy state secretary.

Internal: Quarterly battleplanning is completed as Sungai Aup House meets together for first time since September.

Contradiction: Moving with precision while clouded by ambiguity about future location and field of engagement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Excitement in village mounts as volunteer teams make dramatic progress in laying down water pipes. Pasar opening is set and long night meetings of village committee hammers out operating policies.

Internal: House "Water Wagon" is repaired and in use after five months disability.

Contradiction: Prioritizing and timelining a mountain of tactics. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Involvement and interest in Kelapa Dua HDP grows and manifests itself in 20% adult attendance at stake meetings, steady increase in preschool attendance, and 60 mothers and babies coming for milk and weigh-in.

Internal: Staff and villagers are trained in finances as Management Trek helps straighten up books and begins the set-up of local Board of Directors.

Contradiction: Capturing the interest that is present and turning it into disciplined and responsible leadership. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House is evacuated with two on trek, one on permeation trip to Malaysia, one to Sungai Lui and one completing English course. House returns to find first House Packet.

Internal: House sends out first metro trek team to Central Sumatera to visit ITI grads, introduce ICA and make contacts relative to GCF and GSD.

Contradiction: Allowing the "wait until after the March election" syndrome not to dictate activities. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House staffs intensive development treks in Taipei and Manila, and a Development follow-up week in Hong Kong.

Internal: Barbara Donnelly returns from Development trek with news from across the two areas.

Contradiction: Seeing the link-up between the major events of the zone in the needed perspective of urgency. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Travel funds are raised and tour is sent out to the Korean HDTs, including Wong Ching-On of the auxiliary staff. Economic Acceleration trek arrives and triggers new muchroom and electronics industries. Village landowners agree to sell land to the village for economic ventures. Villagers complete football pitch field and celebrate with a rousing game of soccer. Elders decide to financially support the preschool.

Internal: The auxiliary takes first hot shower in eight months in newly built shower cubicle.

Contradiction: Firming up self-support base in the midst of an acceleration of economic programs with limited troops. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: The ducks arrived in Hai Ou, giving reason for the villagers to work all week to build the facility, install electricity and running water, and secure a brooder and manager. The week was celebrated when the 500 baby ducks began living in their new home.

Internal: John Sung arrives for a two-day visit and Michael Tong comes to sojourn; Charles Tsao visits on Tuesday to enable the stake meetings in Chinese.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the first sign of the first pond intensification. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Development blitz nets 8,500 pesos in-hand and submits 100,000 pesos worth of proposals. Visit with Jaime Zobel y Ayala, symbol of Philippine wealth, puts firm pillar on private sector framing.

Internal: Self-support nets three new Japanese students.

Contradiction: Participating in national development with one-step-at-a-time strategy which meshes with global priorities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Visit to 21 companies in Taipei releases 400,000 (US\$10,000) in proposals submitted.

Internal: House prepares for Chinese New Year.

Contradiction: Finding friends and colleagues inside the structures to open doors in each task arena. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: House brainstorm of minimal "completion" accomplishments is activated as Chinese community agrees to fund a community hall. The president of one of three of the largest corporations in the Philippines agrees to be honorary chairman of the completion celebration. At the same time, his corporation releases 40,000 pesos to start construction of HDTs Training Center. Road proposal for 750,000 pesos is approved in second government office. A proposal is submitted to a local girls college for ten students to spend April with the village after 22 have spent the last two

weekends here.

Internal: Afterwave of Langub Consult hits as Linda and Aren Knutsen, Marge Tomlinson, Pat Druckenmiller, Audrey Ayres and Zenie Armas return.

Contradiction: Developing practical models to do economics and local leadership. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Langub HDP document writing goes on in Barangay Hill while city water district continues drilling the well now through the bedrock down to about 55 feet with water estimated at around 200 feet. Six community volunteers spend the week in preschool teacher training making imaginal decor, and recruiting children for the Langub Daycare Center. Presentation to Kiwanis Club results in the first scheduled cave tour to the Langub cave set for next week when the Kiwanis Club will visit LHDP for a picnic and to see how they can help. Sunday afternoon community assembly initiates the LHDP with guild and stake assignments and announcements of the actuation already happening to a crowd of more than 120.

Internal: Saturday night celebration of dinner and disco dancing for the auxiliary, team and consultants caps off the three-week Langub HDP launching task force work. The Order celebrates the birth of Micah Benjamin to Roy and Geni Philbrook.

Contradiction: Trusting the wisdom of colleagues. (Wk. 5)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: First Tokyo ICA volunteers meeting is a great help in understanding Japanese government structures and agencies. Key Tokyo Guardians meet to plan upcoming Guardians breakfast. Writer Lambert donates 120,000 yen (\$500 US).

Internal: Joseph Kim, 16-year old Korean sojourner, is sent out to Jeju Human Development Training School.

Contradiction: Planning the events that will intrigue and engage the Japanese colleagues and Guardians who are emerging out of the woodwork. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: HDTS begins on January 15 with people from six nations and ten participants from Kyo Doo Il Ri, new Project site in Korea. HDTS Center boiler begins operation. The first work day of the HDTS is spent with 15 villagers cleaning the chicken house. Preschool curriculum for next quarter is done.

Internal: Auxiliary is engaged in HDTS practices and training while packed like a can of sardines.

Contradiction: Continuing, amidst immediacy of HDTS and cold weather which tends to keep villagers and staff alike out of sight. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House translates nine modules for HDTS, recruits participants, sends three faculty to Jeju, intensifies grassroots funding campaign, and receives \$26 bag of inkind sugar for the school.

Internal: Whole House takes two days to build Quarter III maneuvers.

Contradiction: Funding HDTS, a Consult and a new HDP in one month. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Guild translates challenge workshop as John travels from HRM in Naha to GCF in Fukuoka, 600 miles apart, in

one day.

Internal: Professor Sitio from local high school gives House speech on Japanese history, education, culture and geography followed by buffet dinner with student and teachers.

Contradiction: Expanding friends into movemental colleagues. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Two Town Meeting training events cause ten colleagues to struggle with what it means to be a leader who calls Those Who Care.

Internal: Late ecclesiola by candlelight in Generals Room with banana splits and wine celebrates a week of victory that demonstrates the truth in the mustard seed.

Contradiction: Finding that which addresses potential colleagues with the profoundness of these times. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Economic acceleration trek catalyzes new breakthroughs in wood industry expansion with designs being drawn up for children's toys and other breakthroughs in ski/health land use plan and expanded agriculture with the use of vinyl tents.

Internal: House celebrates in Yubari City with the viewing of "Rocky" and dancing and drinks at the Times Bar, being hosted by Mr. and Mrs. Mori, printer of the Oyubari Voice and Jaycee.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between proper procedures and stagnation. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: CTC ends in a blaze of glory with ten making decisions to be assigned.

Internal: House celebrates Corroborree - Oombulgorri completion of phase II - with feast and aboriginal readings. House wrestles through regional quarter battleplan.

Contradiction: Translating proposals for the quarter into hard-nosed models. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Caltex makes unsolicited donation. Regional colleague goes to CTC as faculty. Iron colleague says yes to GWF core and Committee of 100.

Internal: Tribal resettlement becomes necessary event as House members become attached to rooms.

Contradiction: Risking selves in discovering new gemstones, or being constantly about expanding the territory. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Week of final completion Corroborree preparation breaks loose in kind in all shapes and sizes in Darwin. Donor circuit picks up \$1,000 in first call and finds consultants ready and willing for new Project. Five from Darwin attend Oombulgorri completion Corroborree.

Internal: After hosting Yallops on Corroborree preparation and donor circuit, White, Betonte, Norton, Yallops and four colleagues flying back from Oombulgorri are forced to land and are stranded at Port Keats Mission overnight showing radical contrast to Oombulgorri HDP.

Contradiction: Handling priority tasks in the midst of enforced waiting. (Wk. 5)

External: Another building project is completed as Oombulgurri now has a jetty to unload small freight and passengers. More of the community shows up to work than on any other project.

Internal: House sends out primary school teacher, Margaret Halloran, after year of joyous abandon to OHDP.

Contradiction: Naming and preparing the cast that will be up front on the Completion Celebration Day. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: House completes research groundwork for aboriginal Community Meeting campaign. Youth hit \$3,000 goal at close of three-week summer program, covering air fares for May Oombulgurri work trek.

Internal: House prepares to receive seven new troops from adults and three youth as CTC and summer youth program draw to a close.

Contradiction: Utilizing the gift of six strong youth to move with power in the three campaigns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: State campaign in Tasmania is off to a good start as New Norfolk and Kingston say yes to 18th March. Three Oombulgurri apprentice mechanics arrive in Victoria to continue practical training.

Internal: Report of Oombulgurri Corroboree completion celebration is highlighted by presentation of souvenir orange ribbons silk screened by Oombulgurri youth.

Contradiction: Keeping sights on the moving and sometimes obscured targets of GWF, Walkabout and Tasmania schedules. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House participates in Corroboree celebration of OHDP completion with many prominent guests and long telegram from Prime Minister Frazer just as an invitation letter with 69 signatures from new aboriginal community wanting to begin immediately arrives.

Internal: As a result of the unexpected effectiveness of CTC, two-week impact and training construct with 46 participating from five nations and all regions of Area Sydney and many commitments for engagement being made, House spends week building replicable construct for Movement.

Contradiction: Building practical engagement forms for Guardians to accelerate three campaigns' programs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Lyle Johnson, the aboriginal colleague who was recruited to the CTC in one day, returns to Brisbane and raises money and is sent out to Oombulgurri completion Corroboree on the way to Sungai Lui for a year.

Internal: Phase I returns from holidays to begin school year, Hilde returns from CTC with miracle stories and Anthony leaves for three-week trek.

Contradiction: Intensifying the momentum that the programs demand this quarter. (Wk. 5)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Six action guilds plant ten banana trees, position a log for making a three-man outrigger canoe, distribute Shopper's Guide, visit 50 families and complete health surveys, paint the preschool and put up community sign which increases stake participation by 40%.

Internal: House secures a new job for self-support.

Contradiction: Breaking loose consciousness for using tools and experience in engagement. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Second phase village visit reveals that "Faifeau" (pastor) is the only person permitted to call a truly public meeting where all can speak. National preschool director and local doctor invite metro cadre to help organize United Nations project "The Year of the Child" and form a national commission.

Internal: GCF training session on four-hour model excites House with possibilities for use in villages and concludes with send-out of Silk family to Majuro and new assignment.

Contradiction: Using a smaller number of troops to do a growing task. (Wk. 5)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: A GWF task force has its first meeting in Sacramento. Another RS-I is planned for Spring after last week's successful one. A San Jose colleague, Mark Stonebraker, and Roberta Bebe from the San Francisco House join the Great Northern March in Oregon for its final flourishing finish this coming week.

Internal: A gracious evening of Southern hospitality sets the stage for ecclesiola culminating Week I and celebrating the first job secured by the youth cluster to be shared by two of them.

Contradiction: Overcoming the satisfaction with smoothly running immediacies to maintain the tension with long-range power of operating as four Patrols. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Final clean-up of San Jose House readies it for sale. Eight buyers want House and good deal is set for December 15.

Internal: Attendance of San Jose women at the Global Womens Forum and interior decision are key events of GWF on peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating the practical forms for missional task of the metro cadre. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Weekend California Planning Meeting is held in Oak Park Church, with all meals and for motels inkinded. The key 11 maneuvers for California focus on Development, HDP preparation and impact.

Internal: Sacramento Metro Cadre decides to hold monthly ecclesiola meetings and weekly GWF and church impact task forces.

Contradiction: Developing a metro cadre manual that holds tension between comprehensive and particular. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Circuiters set up 21 TMs in Oregon while holding three.

Internal: Rest of House travels to Oregon to join colleagues there for House Church, returning to begin packing for House move.

Contradiction: Making the move of the House an exciting adventure, not a tiring chore. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Mail order strategy in New Mexico nets 17 TMs so far with circuiters still in their inkind motel rooms, while at the western front, the L.A. Times and The est Graduate Review feature articles about the Training School, Maliwada and Integrity. Old and new colleagues, excited about the Maliwada and Nadlapur HDPs, bring refreshing new spirit to Ecclesiola.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES)

Internal: Celebrational spirit explodes at House Church as real trumpet fanfare announces Charles McDermott's birthday; Woljens host dinner for pastor from the Central Valley to solicit support and future engagement in the California Project.

Contradiction: Designing ecclesiolas so that interested people with diverse Movemental experience can participate in an authentic way that leads to further engagement (Wk 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Development team gets 10 churches in process for Week 11 slide shows. Quarterly maneuvers are set up with four task forces assigned. An informal gathering at the Emersons is held with Bob Vance and colleagues to discuss the role of the Movement in the new House.

Internal: The new House takes shape with plumbing work secured in kind and much painted completed. Reilly Schum arrives to sojourn. Twenty five attend House Church.

Contradiction: Securing several vital items that will allow all to move into the new House on timeline. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: All troop focus on Utah TM campaign to hold five TMs set three additional TMs receive TM money developed through the mail and make orchestrator packets

Internal: House life takes on a different flavor as permeator is on the road circuiting for a week and those left in House carry major role on logistics.

Contradiction: Answering the question for communities of "who was that masked man." (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Letters and calls from Margaret and Carl Ennis report that Oregon will be done by February 4. House discusses GWF.

Internal: House celebrates with pizza Robert Vance's coming through on prior's trek.

Contradiction: Balancing out external and internal tasks without one becoming a burden. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Metro and House recruit RS-I of 23 new participants, including several going to GSDs.

Internal: Area prior reports to metro and reflects on the future of the Order, using Bonhoeffer's cost of discipleship.

Contradiction: Keeping fronts moving on Development, Colorado TMs, support base while focus is on Week 8's GWF. (Wk. 4)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Post-grad student with community development, University of Alberta, called excited by the Vogar document and new concept of community development, and makes plans to visit Vogar, come by to talk and offer help.

Internal: Duffy brings news of Area Maneuver: B.C. as he stops for a day on his way to Montreal for conversations on funding grants which could relieve self-support dilemma. Cluster secures two of three new part-time jobs as David Woodbury graduates with honors from high school and starts job hunting.

Contradiction: Creating the structures which move interested people to engaged colleagues. (Wk 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: House orchestrates CFCs on Vancouver Island. Set-up team including Week II blitz set dates for seven more CFCs in Vancouver and lower mainland Development.

Internal: Maneuver troops from Development, Research and Operations Centrums spin House through collegiums on the current continental and global edges. We feast at most popular restaurant in town with manager picking up the tab for all we want.

Contradiction: Orchestrating victories on all fronts without bracketing any activity required now. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Two new districts go gold in opposite ends of the state, with a TM grad traveling back to former hometown to lead a workshop. Town Meeting gets more good publicity with a radio interview. GWF gets off the ground as sponsors meet to design brochure.

Internal: House celebrates two more counties with a "golding celebration." Emerging Generation RS-I demonstrates the limits and possibilities of life for all, and acts as a penetration tool as three children whose families have had no previous contact participate.

Contradiction: Being the catalytic presence that uses all available resources to gold the region and do impact courses. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Colleague visitations illuminate readiness of old Movement grads to engage in three campaigns.

Internal: House celebrates the new year with colleagues joining in new circuit game based on Monopoly.

Contradiction: Allowing colleagues to experience the formation of the new Movement and see others engaged in the common task over distance. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG-VOGAR HDP

External: Development team brings in \$1,400. House meets with Senator Gil Molgat who shows openness and strong support. and keeps an appointment with a Winnipeg contractor who was interested in visiting with and helping out some men in Vogar with subcontracting. The community store makes a record \$1,168.86, double what has been done before.

Internal: House lays linoleum on the kitchen floor in the midst of hosting six people who arrive to begin the Health Trek.

Contradiction: Keeping everyone in the community engaged in the momentum of the maneuver. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: TMs happen in the midst of set-up of both fronts. Western front goes to Odessa and San Angela as southern front moves to Brownsville and Corpus Christi. Twenty thousand workbooks are at binders awaiting covers.

Internal: Hard decisions are made at fronts relative to the geography and deployment of troops while at home another fine Ecclesiola is celebrated

Contradiction: Increasing permeator participation in the TM Campaign. (Wk 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: House schedules six TMS for Monday out of the Western Front of Lone Star Stampede and Muleshoe in Bailey County. Samarai launch three congregations in Amarillo toward Adopt-A-Village proposals.

Internal: House sends flowers to celebrate the completed lives of Barbara Smith in Pace and infant granddaughter of Jann Barr in Michigan

Contradiction: Choosing the next visible signs after counties completion through the global priorities (Wk 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Lone Star Stampede enters third week of circuits in the six-week maneuver with 14 dates set on Southern Front.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO)

Internal: San Antonio business community continues to make maneuver planning and debriefing Week IIs great events at mealtimes.

Contradiction: Going back to old territory when the new is beckoning (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Colleagues and House meet to initiate GYF/GWF maneuvers.

Internal: House sends Cameron Grow out to Texas Lone Star Maneuver for a week of TMs.

Contradiction: Building the engagement network that has emerged from an awakened region (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Set up for Lone Star Stampede continues with one page brochure completed and teams sent to San Antonio and Lubbock from sector meeting in Dallas. Original director of Gaosl for Dallas, Dr. Bryant Godbold, visits House for very successful discussion of Town Meeting program in Texas.

Internal: Emerging Generation presents Saturday night play "Kawangware: Place of Glory" with champagne and chocolate chip cookies.

Contradiction: Intensifying effectiveness on two fronts of Lone Star Stampede which are both over five hours away. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: A proposal is submitted to EDA at their request, accompanied by four Pace citizens beginning a course in small business management. Final decision is made on annexation area in comprehensive plan.

Internal: The celebration of the completed life of Barbara Joan Smith takes place on Saturday, January 28, with whole House's integral participation in both practices and drama.

Contradiction: Focusing action in visible miracles while simultaneously doing necessary long-range tactics. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: With troops spread out across the south Day II troops set up one Town Meeting

Internal: House obtains a three-hour night job that almost reaches the self-support goal

Contradiction: Maintaining the stance of the spirit man in the midst of the shortage of troops (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Week begins with '76 maneuver contact mailing \$100 for "that TM they still want to have" and ends with a week living off the land in Jackson, Mississippi. Two TMs were held in the ice in West Tennessee and three TMs were set by three teams on Saturday. Xerox, Pacers, county supervisors and businessmen sign up as Mississippi TM advocates. Amid the snow and ice, troops travel to New Orleans for last-minute briefing to take Mississippi.

Internal: Inkind rent for January comes in with future looking rent-free.

Contradiction: Developing troops for circuits and orchestration for Mississippi maneuver. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: The Atlanta House works with three area patrol team to create the model and initiate visits that will move the Atlanta Region toward becoming a major source for developing funds. House receives its first significant contribution ever in the form of a \$500 check from the Trust Company Banks of Georgia.

Internal: Local colleague couple invite selves to ecclesiola and arrive with steak and chicken for all as "The New Castle" study provides basis for spin-offs on Profound Humanness.

Contradiction: Breaking open self-support so that another circuit team can get on the road. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: The Tarheel Cotillion maneuver dances along: 13 TMs held, \$6,150 promised.

Internal: Self-support team creates a consultant brochure for the long sword and lands temporary office job for the short sword. Youth lands CETA position to do TM office work maintaining the maneuver's momentum and corporateness.

Contradiction: Developing field contacts that can allow TM set-up over the phone. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: House combines circuit south with a visit with colleagues and House Church in West Palm Beach. Seven TMs happen on schedule, including Citrus County.

Internal: Talking "face to face" with colleagues existentially freshens the definition of collegiality.

Contradiction: Maintaining a base of operation while it is necessary to be away most of the time. (Wk. 5)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Circuiters are sent out to four state campaigns in ongoing effort to supply the special forces troops. Team leaves for Ivy City economic trek, experiencing wave of great success while there.

Internal: Wedge teams from Africa and India return, bearing miracle stories of key authorization and development contacts. Research Centrum works on a corporate pull-together of collective wisdom on group methods, and, in so doing, recovers excitement about methods.

Contradiction: Effectively tying together troop needs here with global demands for funding, circuiters and treks. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Simultaneous attack is made on contradiction from many fronts: Development \$8,000 in hand and breakthrough in local TM funding; 5th citizens rebuild community center boiler and do economic intensification trek in Ivy City; Iron Man statue is presented to senator Percy and H.U.D. releases major funding for housing development.

Internal: Enablement by student cluster makes 62 TMs a tranquil sea.

Contradiction: Communicating the new in TM saturation with images to further release Global Community Forum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: One regional and one global staff make up the team for the world's first Chamber of Commerce LENS Consult where a group of businessmen and government representatives devised their priorities for the coming year. Even with a short format, the product indicated that the event went beyond awakening to facilitating realistic follow-up.

Internal: Indicative maneuver creation reveals that hard core development of regional monies and troops is the heart and edge of the awakening and demonstration campaigns.

Contradiction: Deciding corporately on quotas and priorities to individuals can take responsibility for whole group. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Two TMs are held in S. Illinois, bringing recent total of House to twelve. Conditions of the town and seriousness of the local leaders about rebuilding in Ewing, Ill., make us think of GSD. Pocahontas set for next week. Mailing for Open House sent this week.

Internal: We in kind 34 gallons of paint and two meals for 40 which thirteen people devour ravenously during fantastic work day of scraping, plastering, and painting with help from our friends, the Student House.

Contradiction: In the midst of Missouri and Illinois coming ready for a funding blitz simultaneously, we find ourselves having scheduled a large Open House for the same weekend as Priors' Council, proving once again that you can't be everywhere at once. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Iowa Farm Bureau Federation agrees to host TM Assembly at their new facility in Des Moines, 18 TMs are set with 64 more to go. Two Development visits yield \$550 for TM: Iowa

Internal: House welcomes Dedinia Nones on reassignment from Chicago Nexus.

Contradiction: Releasing troops to sustain the momentum. (Wk 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Fantastic weekend training event gets colleagues infected with TM/GSD fever through mail order set-up model and site selection issues forum. Troops return from week in Kansas City reporting on the most radical new Town Meeting set-up models since Oklahoma 100.

Internal: Sojourner decides to stay an extra three days to care for sick Emerging Generation after being released from her circuiting commitment. House takes advantage of blizzard as stranded colleagues and permeators join in to decor corporate space and prepare for new Town Meeting campaign.

Contradiction: Broadening the awareness of the growing momentum in the metro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Celebrative mood of continental council, area council and bimetro council planning meeting calls forth plans for fantastic New Year's eve.

Internal: Newsletter and Xerox address labels are all printed inkind by Blackhawk Corporation.

Contradiction: Maintaining TM momentum during season of celebration. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Town Meeting: Indiana continues to move as four more TMs are held, completing the Northeastern 9, while Lafayette and Indianapolis cadres move on seven new counties each. GWF looks good in Lafayette for February 11 with 33 registered and a \$10,000 proposal submitted for 10 more around the state this spring.

Internal: Metro and House colleagues gather for House Church and send Mig Wildhack out to Africa for the Kenyan and Zambian Consults.

Contradiction: Dealing quickly and forthrightly with the next 20 counties. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Phone calls to colleagues and letter of authorization from the president of the Glenmary Fathers Home missionaries opens vision of Kentucky advance. Over 200 invitations to Evening at the Institute enable the updating of the mailing list.

Internal: Blizzard victim. Don Bushman, is stranded here for three days; he enables thorough Kentucky battleplan.

Contradiction: Getting the traction to move out after the big snow. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Three Town Meetings are held. Len Hockley opens authorization and Development doors by visiting old family friends. Three teams grid an area of Detroit in preparation for Town Meetings.

Internal: Moving on self-support through search for job, grant, and a new facility.

Contradiction: Coordinating troop engagement in all areas, regionally and continentally. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Initial work on battleplan for Kentucky counties and Quarter III results in exciting pain for all fronts.

Internal: House life battleplanning to care for urban mission and support systems for Quarter III happens.

Contradiction: Expanding forces in midst of battlefront coverage. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Five Pennsylvania Town Meetings are staffed by Global Servant Force from New York and New Jersey. Harrisburg, Pa. on Monday evening finished eastern Pennsylvania campaign with David VerNooy and Ethyl Gaynes orchestrating in the Fire Hall.

Internal: Send-out of James Kelly to Caracas followed by Latin American collegium lends mood of anticipation for recruitment to the four consults.

Contradiction: Learning how to excite contacts in communities to generate TM funding and attendance. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: The Samurai visit results in identification of future consultants for HDPs and possibility of local congregation Adopt-a-village.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality releases non-residents and first time guests to deal with space symbolically.

Contradiction: Building the vision that releases the revolutionary spirit in local activity (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: In the midst of planning Finger Lake Folly and Western Loop circuit, the House sets four appointments for CYF and receives a copy of a letter submitted with proposed Village Adoption Program. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: House sends logistics and circuit teams west after Saturday morning champagne breakfast celebration of Town Meetings completed in eastern PA.

Internal: House prepares the Eastern Pennsylvania Assembly mailing.

Contradiction: Deepening and broadening the commitment of the Global Servant Force. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Field troops schedule GWF for March 10, set up two Town Meetings in Hudson County and explode CYF possibilities all over New Jersey.

Internal: Latin American collection enables expansion to be contradicted with new steps and intentional recruitment for Latin American consults.

Contradiction: Learning how to excite contacts in communities to generate TM funding while they generate the TM itself. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Nassau County comes alive as four Week II teams set up four TMs. Evening TM is key to response.

Internal: Nan Bailey comes back from Area Houston TM: North Carolina and shares excitement of the Tarheel Cotillion.

Contradiction: Learning how to excite contacts in communities to generate TM funding and attendance. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: The Hartford and Boston Houses and colleagues converge on Rutland County, Vermont and visit ten towns in a county saturation maneuver.

Internal: A visit by a Development team results in the decision of Paul Evans to embark on a three-Consult trek to Africa and Europe.

Spotlight also is on training with a Global Academy PSU on construct and course refinement to accord with practical necessity. Human Development Project experiences continue to emphasize the practical dimension of research. At all locations, colleagues stand in need of Profound Humanness reflection and thought, amid practical demands of far more immediate and pressing weight.

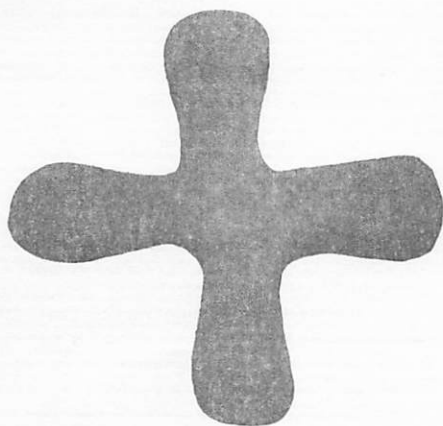

Contradiction: Finding ways to keep the urgency of February as death ground for the Year of the U.K. before all. (Wk 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Three teams circuit on a daily basis. Development breaks loose 100 pounds. Command center gets TM active files in working order. Another inkind car brings number of cars inkinded to four. Two TM dates are set.

Internal: Week II is launched with informal dinner and fire in the fireplace to welcome home the warriors who braved winter blizzard to get back to Glasgow Friday evening.

Contradiction: Moving with present authorization to get TM dates set quickly. (Wk 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Rally Day with the communities who held TMs in Wales November and December results in "yes, continue this worthwhile project."

Internal: With the presence of the Panchayat trek, the House enjoys hearing "first hand" of Africa, India and USA

Contradiction: Clarifying priorities for the next circuits. (Wk. 5)

Internal: Experience of discontinuity at a time in which even more happens than usual as visitors from Paris and Rome spend time in Termine; House celebrates Christmas with midnight mass followed by a 2 a.m. dinner and prepares to meet a new quarter of victory with three days of planning.

Contradiction: Pushing against the Italian trend of away from villages by deciding to do rural communities. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Wedge, health acceleration team and GWF staff arrive all within two days of each other to impact Ijede and Nigeria. Onitsha GWF with 222 women from across eastern

External: Vienna LENS is confirmed. Munich LENS is projected and Frankfurt GWF is set. Berlin participates in Ruhr Valley maneuver as three TMs and three HRMs are set.

Internal: Friends of Frankfurt House begin series of regular meetings focused on village development

Contradiction: Creating a command center dynamic when nobody is hoje. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG, OST HDP

External: Community office and production room are established in Centrum as three Global Language Schools begin and new community task forces plan economic and social programs. Laxdals and Howies begin health trek and social methods school involves community as well as people from West Germany.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality gives absolution over House time design as health trek, training school and program make increased demands.

Contradiction: Intensifying working together while carving out appropriate meeting time. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Bishop James Mathews and team visit Zambia. Great meeting with His Excellency President K. Kaunda secures blessings on HDP in Zambia. Chief Mungule welcomes village site visits in his area, same location of village GWF. Bishop Mathews and Dr. Pesek are honored guests at LENS/GWF follow-up reception. Four grads say yes in four hours for one year in HDP. Development and authorization visits flood the Bishop's week.

Internal: Of four sojourners in blue in House during discontinuity, one stays for intern year.

Contradiction: Nailing down the last corner of authorization rug in preparation for going to new HDP site. (WK. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad Trade Fair draws 50 visitors from Cairo, including British ambassador's wife and adding to 100 Jesuit school students already in Bayad for three days of work and 16 architecture students who do sketches of future plaza. Highly profitable marmalade industry makes first sales. Seventy-five all drims plus transport and wood for fish farm is inkinded, as well as four cages are prepared for floating in ethe Nile. Beautiful brick samples are taken by village employee for testing. Experimental plot in the desert is irrigated and planted. Bayad market opens. Guest flat is inkinded in CAIRO. GCF Egypt is launched with great demonstration village visit in Bayad.

Internal: Global Wedge team visits and spins House into practical grasp of maneuvering with overfilled table at every meal, including strong village presence with three new interns.

Contradiction: Creating the structural forms to allow Project acceleration to continue. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Five Village Meetings are held during discontinuity. Front running village for new project passes all tests to date with fantastic Village Meeting, authorization and receptivity. Four out of five Village Meetings add new yellow to Kenya map; Director General of Muslim Council wants VM in every Muslim village in Kenya and they will pay. Unexpected K.Shs. 21,000 arrives in mail.

Internal: First trainee to be sponsored by the Muslim Council arrives at project with suitcase in hand.

Contradiction: Taking anxieties about imminent shifts as motivation rather than paralysis. (Wk. 2).

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical 2 Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOM MBAY

External: City Bank runs quarter page advertisement lighting Maliwada project in major India papers. Tata's Mahal Hotel makes the first instalment on Chikhale sponsorship. House meets the vice-president of the Century who shows keen interest in sponsoring a village.

Internal: Christmas Eve was celebrated with which treats thirty-one souls to the finest Kerala feast, exchange of gifts, carol singing and the arrival of Hemalatha J and Kavitha from Calcutta.

Contradiction: Establishing the interior modes for Ashram Operations which will enable devising the service structures to meet the needs of the explosion of Nava Gram Prayas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

External: In village shramdam, preschool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: House sends Marie Paul out to Agra for the pump and completes more work on U.S. AID. Delhi House initiative results in Newzland rupees 21,000.

Internal: Global team visits India.

Contradiction: Winning with half the adults out for two months. (Wk. 5)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TISCO, one of the largest private industrial enterprises in India, asks ICA to conduct one-day seminar on "Big Business in Rural Development" on March 4, in Jamshedpur in eastern India.

Internal: With the arrival of all the House furniture from the storage warehouse, a new relationship to space is appropriated.

Contradiction: Honoring the establishment's demands for rural development participation in midst of acting out ICA timeline for the same thing. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House sends Ken and Peggy Wiltse together with Miriam Rumps (Peggy's mother) on Management trek to Kelapa Dua to build structure for Indonesian visibility and complete area GCF maneuver modex for Area Singapore.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS)

Internal: House finally completes tribal resettlement with moving of the men and women's dorm.

Contradiction: Acting to resolve the doubt that theory cannot solve. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: GCF task force does back-up and planning for major campaign in Southeast Asia. Sarawak State Development officer submits HDP proposal to deputy state secretary.

Internal: Quarterly battleplanning is completed as Sungai Aup House meets together for first time since September.

Contradiction: Moving with precision while clouded by ambiguity about future location and field of engagement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: House finds itself in the midst of national and international interests, including a meeting with the National Coordinating Committee for Community Development in Malaysia. Contradiction: Capturing the interest that is present and turning it into disciplined and responsible leadership. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

Internal: Barbara Donnelly returns from Development trek with news from across the two areas.

Contradiction: Seeing the link-up between the major events of the zone in the needed perspective of urgency. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Travel funds are raised and tour is sent out to the Korean HDTS, including Wong Ching-On of the auxiliary staff. Economic Acceleration trek arrives and triggers new mushroom and electronics industries. Village landowners agree to sell land to the village for economic ventures. External: The ducks arrived in Hai Ou, giving reason for the villagers to work all week to build the facility, install electricity and running water, and secure a brooder and manager. The week was celebrated when the 500 baby ducks began living in their new home.

Internal: John Sung arrives for a two-day visit and Michael Tong comes to sojourn: Charles Tsao visits on Tuesday to enable the stake meetings in Chinese.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the first sign of the first pond intensification. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Development blitz nets 8,500 pesos in-hand and submits 100,000 pesos worth of proposals. Visit with Jaime Zobel y Ayala, symbol of Philippine wealth, puts firm pillar on private sector framing.

Internal: Self-support nets three new Japanese students.

Contradiction: Participating in national development with one-step-at-a-time strategy which meshes with global priorities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Visit to 21 companies in Taipei releases 400,000 (US\$10,000) in proposals submitted.

Internal: House prepares for Chinese New Year.

Contradiction: Finding friends and colleagues inside the structures to open doors in each task arena. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: House brainstorm of minimal "completion" accomplishments is activated as Chinese community agrees to fund a community hall. The president of one of three of the largest corporations in the Philippines agrees to be honorary chairman of the completion celebration. At the same time, his corporation releases 40,000 pesos to start construction of HDTS Training Center. Road proposal for 750,000 pesos is approved in second government office. A proposal is submitted to a local girls college for ten students to spend April with the village after 22 have spent the last two weekends here.

Internal: Afterwave of Langub Consult hits as Linda and Aren Knutsen, Marge Tomlinson, Pat Druckenmiller, Audrey Ayres and Zenie Armas return.

Contradiction: Developing practical models to do economics and local leadership. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO-LANGUB HDP

External: Langub HDP document writing goes on in Barangay Hall while city water district continues drilling the well now through the bedrock down to about 55 feet with water estimated at around 200 feet. Six community volunteers spend the week in preschool teacher training, making imaginal decor, and recruiting children for the

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE DAVAO-LANGUB HDP)

Langub Daycare Center. Presentation to Kiwanis Club results in the first scheduled cave tour to the Langub cave set for next week when the Kiwanis Club will visit LHDP for a picnic and to see how they can help. Sunday afternoon community assembly initiates the LHDP with guild and stake assignments and announcements of the actuation already happening to a crowd of more than 120.

Internal: Saturday night celebration of dinner and disco dancing for the auxiliary, team and consultants caps off the three-week Langub HDP launching task force work. The Order celebrates the birth of Micah Benjamin to Roy and Geni Philbrook.

Contradiction: Trusting the wisdom of colleagues. (Wk. 5)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: J.A.T.E.S., Japan Technology Society, shows great interest in I.C.A., publishing techniques and accomplishments in their periodical.

Internal: Four members of the Tokyo and Oyubari Houses are engaged in an "English Intensive" that nets \$25,000 for two weeks' work.

Contradiction: Marshalling the treasury and weaponry blocked by uninventoried storehouse and armory. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: HDTS begins on January 15 with people from six nations and ten participants from Kyo Doo Il Ri, new Project site in Korea. HDTS Center boiler begins operation. The first work day of the HDTS is spent with 15 villagers cleaning the chicken house. Preschool curriculum for next quarter is done.

Internal: Auxiliary is engaged in HDTS practices and training while packed like a can of sardines.

Contradiction: Continuing, amidst immediacy of HDTS and cold weather which tends to keep villagers and staff alike out of sight. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House translates nine modules for HDTS, recruits participants, sends three faculty to Jeju, intensifies grassroots funding campaign, and receives \$26 bag of inkind sugar for the school.

Internal: Whole House takes two days to build Quarter III maneuvers.

Contradiction: Funding HDTS, a Consult and a new HDP in one month. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

Internal: Feet under the table (table with heater under it) conversation on youth revolution provides reflective discontinuity in a week of doing GWF and GCF.

Contradiction: Finding the pace that will sustain all forces on the long march. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Follow-up of economic acceleration trek continues as two community businessmen prepare details for making samples for proposed wood toy industry. Metro circuit is completed to all six metros promising many ITI recruits and future TMs. Sixteen appointments are made to neighboring towns by Yubari Social Education Director initiating the "Hokkaido 40" Maneuver for TM (chiiki-kon-dan-kai).

Internal: With the continuing crisis over limited number of Japanese-speaking troops, Mr. Masahito Tonosaki shows up unexpectedly and announces "I am here to be a volunteer for the next six weeks."

Contradiction: Balancing act in the community between following proper procedures and performing revolutionary, catalytic deeds. (Wk. 6)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: New South Wales aboriginal community, Murrin Bridge, sends letter of invitation with 90 signatures requesting Consult next week.

Internal: Troops reconfiguration and Day II planning allow all to get new handles on task.

Contradiction: Ensuring comprehensive and practical campaign plans that increase and balance momentum between each maneuver. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: GWF core meets and lays groundwork for series of GWFs in March. Four families strongly affirm being on Committee of 1,000.

Internal: House welcomes three youth to new assignment, hosts Garnet Banks, Kim Thornton and Whites for the week and sends out Anne Clampeat to teach at OHDP.

Contradiction: Occasioning depth commitment through explosive use of time. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Week of final completion Corroborree preparation breaks loose in kind in all shapes and sizes in Darwin. Donor circuit picks up \$1,000 in first call and finds consultants ready and willing for new Project. Five from Darwin attend Oombulgurri completion Corroborree.

Internal: After hosting Yallops on Corroborree preparation and donor circuit, White, Betonte, Norton, Yallops and four colleagues flying back from Oombulgurri are forced to land and are stranded at Port Keats Mission overnight showing radical contrast to Oombulgurri HDP.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE)

Internal: The \$1,000 check from the Schools Commission for the planned May Oombulgurri youth trek arrives and is plugged into ICA finances.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary reshuffling of House space and office systems without slackening momentum. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: State campaign in Tasmania is off to a good start as New Norfolk and Kingston say yes to 18th March. Three Oombulgurri apprentice mechanics arrive in Victoria to continue practical training.

Internal: Report of Oombulgurri Corroboree completion celebration is highlighted by presentation of souvenir orange ribbons silk screened by Oombulgurri youth.

Contradiction: Keeping sights on the moving and sometimes obscured targets of GWF, Walkabout and Tasmania schedules. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House participates in Corroboree celebration of OHDP completion with many prominent guests and long telegram from Prime Minister Frazer just as an invitation letter with 69 signatures from new aboriginal community wanting to begin immediately arrives.

Internal: As a result of the unexpected effectiveness of CTC, two-week impact and training construct with 46 participating from five nations and all regions of Area Sydney and many commitments for engagement being made, House spends week building replicable construct for Movement.

Contradiction: Building practical engagement forms for Guardians to accelerate three campaigns' programs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Cloncurry says a yes to CMA in rural Shire GWF holds speaking engagements with United Church Women and Union of Australian woman. Betonte struggles through Queensland geography as wet season closes roads with flooding.

Internal: Planning session formulates next steps for external mission.

Contradiction: Concretizing deep resolve and training for colleagues' promising engagement. (Wk. 6)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

Internal: Revolutionary grocery shopping model is implemented and hallway bulletin board is re-decorated.

Contradiction: Holding the revolutionary edge in task force planning. (Wk. 3)

External: Second week of Rendez-vous: Quebec campaign occasions an explosion of possibility with six CFCs held and eight more set up. The town of Saint Andre, New Brunswick, assigns a mother of two young children as a full-time circuiter for a week. Six cases of pop are inked for an impending Community Youth Forum.

Internal: Sherine James finally arrives from India and educates House to the gifts of Tobacco sauce and curry.

Internal: Guardians, cadre, Cano Negro Secretariat, auxiliary staff and Latin American expansion team meet to create maneuvers for HDTS and end with a celebration at Guardian's home and Cano Negro slide show.

Contradiction: Integrating HDTS set-up maneuvers into a six-month completion timeline so as to create the single focus and relate all fronts. (Wk. 5)

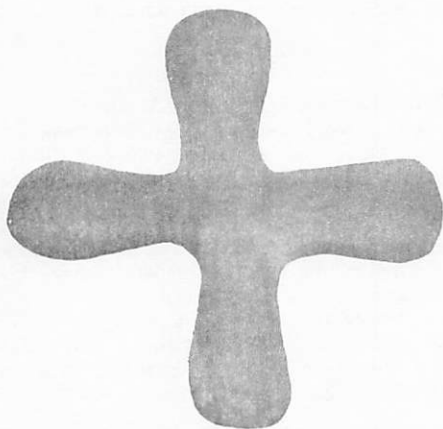

Contradiction: Finding ways to keep the urgency of February as death ground for the Year of the U.K. before all. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Three teams circuit on a daily basis. Development breaks loose 100 pounds. Command center gets TM active files in working order. Another inkind car brings number of cars inkind to four. Two TM dates are set.

Internal: Week II is launched with informal dinner and fire in the fireplace to welcome home the warriors who braved winter blizzard to get back to Glasgow Friday evening.

Contradiction: Moving with present authorization to get TM dates set quickly. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Research into Wales HDP intensifies, as selection of site shifts in light of major plan for re-designing the community already afoot.

Internal: Stephen Evans returns after several weeks on assignment to London to head up Wales HDP site selection team.

Contradiction: Obtaining the front-end authorization of very potent Labour Party to do project in their "back garden." (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Pushing the 40 trained colleagues to do TM England set-up and pledge a pound grassroots support secured their overwhelming commitment.

Internal: Emerging Generation member's best friend's mother says yes to care for E.G. in the morning and after school to free up Day I person to go on the road for the whole week.

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forty-five people at the Forum communautaire in Epinay-sur-Odon, a farming community of 350 people in Normandie, keep right on working without a pause when, in the middle of the Challenges Workshop, a storm blows out the electricity and the Forum has to be completed by candlelight.

Internal: The first Forum Communautaire document to be produced in France (Epinay-sur-Odon) is presented to the House amidst a celebrative Saturday lunch and is followed by the regular Saturday Open House in which we meet three great new contacts.

Contradiction: Clarifying priorities for the next circuits. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: The week begins with a Christmas Eve youth dance, a huge bonfire in the Piazza and midnight mass and ends with a victorious New Year's Eve dance. Community leadership decides to take on responsibility for the project at midweek Comitato meeting

Internal: Experience of discontinuity at a time in which even more happens than usual as visitors from Paris and Rome spend time in Termine; House celebrates Christmas with midnight mass followed by a 2 a.m. dinner and prepares to meet a new quarter of victory with three days of planning.

Contradiction: Pushing against the Italian trend of away from villages by deciding to do rural communities. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Dried brush on the new Lowland Farm site, cleared in December on two workdays in preparation for planting is burned. Thirty-two prominent Lagos women from ten different associations attend the third GWF held.

Internal: Ato Coleman arrives from Ghana for intern year.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

Contradiction: Holding the comprehensive while winning in every arena. (Wk. 7)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Two Town Meetings in Belgium this week create very good orchestrators ready to go anywhere. Thirteen more TMs before March 9th are scheduled.

Internal: House participates in Week II PSU on impact.

Contradiction: Balancing the tension between self-support and doing all of Flanders by Quarter IV. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS:

External: House receives additional f1575 (\$700) from Wild Goose Foundation for El Bayad. Lion's Tail Maneuver moves closer to Belgian/Dutch border with another steering committee set-up.

Internal: Two Dutch nurses are sent out with celebration for six months in Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Finding the economic institutions with ties to the local to undergird Town Meeting costs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The Dutch Walter Cronkite interviews Mark Poole as El Bayad is featured for the second time on Dutch national television, providing further national authorization.

Internal: The House gets new grounding in HDP miracles from collegiums by John Kroeger and Claudia Haman on El Bayad and Ijede.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on the advantage of trained Flemish colleagues in Belgian Limburg to expand our circuit teams. (Wk. 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Eight Town Meetings are now set in the Ruhr and North Rhein Valleys with break-open into their eastern half of this area through church contacts in Dortmund and Gladbeck. Adopt-a-village is proposed to ecumenical church council of Preungesheim. M.T. George, one-time Indian ITI staff member, is alive and well in Krefeld and anxious to get involved. Seventeen from top Austrian development aid agencies attend weekend LENS Seminar in Vienna.

Internal: Mailing for February 11 GWF consumes House's evening energies.

Contradiction: Maintaining a single corporate thrust in the midst of intensive battles on many scattered fronts. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Social acceleration team visits 200 people getting 80 positive responses, 17 coming for night-time training. Of the two of those present every night, one decides to go to Chicago summer program. A newly graduated law student who speaks five languages decides to stay on for a couple of weeks. Meanwhile, cafe finances show a steady income. Eight new people show up for language school, three of whom are Turkish. The secretariat creates a new guild leadership model.

Internal: Four room acceleration team, one from Termine and one from Brussels Centrum join House and several from community in working together, giving all a new experience of community living.

Contradiction: Bringing a single focus into the complexity of myriad activities. (Wk. 7)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Kapini Village is chosen as the demonstration site

with Shantumbu to be completed as part of expansion. Meeting with village leaders to explain the project brings full and enthusiastic response. Major funding Safari Maneuver picks up positive scent on two of the "Big Five," while Small Game Maneuver picks up \$2,500 for the week.

Internal: House receives new intern, Hezeron Chikalipa, and celebrates Kapini HDP decision by watching the HDP slide show. House Church celebration is enhanced with all around the table wearing the blue.

Contradiction: Sorting through the glowing haze of grad enthusiasm to locate those who will pick up their bags and "move it" to the HDP site in five weeks time. (Wk. 7)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad Trade Fair draws 50 visitors from Cairo, including British ambassador's wife and adding to 100 Jesuit school students already in Bayad for three days of work and 16 architecture students who do sketches of future plaza. Highly profitable marmalade industry makes first sales. Seventy-five all drims plus transport and wood for fish farm is inkinded, as well as four cages are prepared for floating in ethe Nile. Beautiful brick samples are taken by village employee for testing. Experimental plot in the desert is irrigated and planted. Bayad market opens. Guest flat is inkinded in CAIRO. GCF Egypt is launched with great demonstration village visit in Bayad.

Internal: Global Wedge team visits and spins House into practical grasp of maneuvering with overfilled table at every meal, including strong village presence with three new interns.

Contradiction: Creating the structural forms to allow Project acceleration to continue. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Consultant from Homa Lime Co. arrives to build house in Kamivelini. Wellcome Kenya Ltd. gives contract to Kawangware Construction Industry to build poultry house on DUF. Government offices in Machahas assign staff to Kamivelini Consult. Local man Machahas, Guardian and ICA staff create powerful team to do authorization calls. World Neighbors sends first payment of grant for 31000 Kenya shillings.

Internal: Kawangware people join Kamivelini people to make passable a road not used in six years, catalyzing a fantastic workday. Carin Shucart arrives early for Consult and plugs in to move prep along as Ann Muthori and daughter Regina and Dickson Ngugi begin sojourn. John Rupert Barnes is carried across river in Kamivelini by female elder and staff joins community for workday at new project site.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between authorization's time lines and project's. (Wk. 7)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE. BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India nears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY)

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOM MBAY

External: Dr. Van Estendal, Board member of ICA Brussels, makes his fifteenth trip to India, particularly to see Maliwada which he claims is "one of the most beautiful villages" he has ever visited.

Internal: House sends out Mollie Clements to Chicago after three years in Bombay and Guardians Warren and Carolyn Crane after one month sojourn in Maharashtra villages.

Contradiction: Creating a new universe through the disciplined use of evening structures to embrace the intrusion of GWF set-up. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: In village shramdam, preschool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Ranganath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE. SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge wover Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Proj5ct battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Marie Paul inkind water pump from Agra for Vaviharsh HDP. GWF recruitment begins and inkinded GWF brochures are provided by Delhi Guardian, Mr. Gaur.

Internal: House engages in six hours of marathon battleplanning for the quarter.

Contradiction: Finding ways of catalyzing the engagement of spirit soldiers in overwhelming missional possibilities. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: One hundred men, women and children get together to roll two 4400 pound pipes three kilometers to the village. Republic Day is celebrated with morning flag raising ceremony and all-day sports competitions.

Internal: Two new people join the auxiliary. Mr. Padmarao, who came as a driver, after 24 hours decided to join the auxiliary.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP)

Contradiction: Doing the comprehensive plan while maintaining the excitement of the villagers. (Wk. 7)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Visit to Chairman of Development in Bankura, West Bengal, one of the poorest districts in the state, yields possibility of village development project with financing. This is the second one on the horizon in eastern India.

Internal: House takes on new substance as library and office space is set up.

Contradiction: Concretizing the decision to do a village project in eastern India in the midst of sustaining the Calcutta House. (Wk. 7)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Return of CTC participants, Anthon Welerang and Suhardi signals go ahead with GCF, beginning in Sungai Lui.

Internal: Saturday collegium is highlighted with reports from Com CTC participants on what it meant to them and the zone.

Contradiction: Getting the first GCF maneuver launched. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: GCF task force does back-up and planning for major campaign in Southeast Asia. Sarawak State Development officer submits HDP proposal to deputy state secretary.

External: The first clean water public washing, bathing, and toilet facilities is completed with inkind labor and village labor-8 more to go!

Internal: Soehardi returns from CTC in Australia excited about doing GCF in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Focusing midquarter the weak points in the Physical Vitality Task Force in order to create one thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House is evacuated with two on trek, one on permeation trip to Malaysia, one to Sungai Lui and one completing English course. House returns to find first House Packet.

Internal: House sends out first metro trek team to Central Sumatera to visit ITI grads, introduce ICA and make contacts

relative to GCF and GSD.

Contradiction: Allowing the "wait until after the March election" syndrome not to dictate activities. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House staffs intensive development treks in Taipei and Manila, and a Development follow-up week in Hong Kong.

Internal: Barbara Donnelly returns from Development trek with news from across the two areas.

Contradiction: Seeing the link-up between the major events of the zone in the needed perspective of urgency. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Stake meetings are re-initiated for the quarter. Nam Wai Recreation Guild calls itself into being through village initiative and creates maneuver to raise funds for fencing of football field. Primary tutorial group celebrates with an outing and bar-b-que while village youth tour U.S.S. Oklahoma City. Village chairman calls for meeting on preschool for re-election of school board at suggestion of elders' guild. Another woodpile is cut and stacked with help of project power saw. Two more workers sign up for new Nam Wai electronics industry, including the wife of an HDTs participant and a crippled lady who says "why not me?!" Mushroom house is steam sterilized and bedding composted in preparation for first spore inoculation. Nam Wai Voice printing is inkinded and electric typewriter is donated to project.

Internal: Kitchen roof and walls are completed and collegium room and office retiled in project center. Study rhythm is injected in the midst of external expenditure.

Contradiction: Structuring community desire and engagement in a futuristic way (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: The ducks arrived in Hai Ou, giving reason for the villagers to work all week to build the facility, install electricity and running water, and secure a brooder and manager. The week was celebrated when the 500 baby ducks began living in their new home.

Internal: John Sung arrives for a two-day visit and Michael Tong comes to sojourn; Charles Tsao visits on Tuesday to enable the stake meetings in Chinese.

Contradiction: Camouflaging the first sign of the fish pond intensification. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: National YWCA invites GWF for first day of its annual national convention. January development exceeds goal.

Internal: House is pleasantly surprised with San Felipe Neri parish PCE 2nd anniversary celebration invitation and is impacted by singing, decor, and reports.

Contradiction: Framing the private sector comprehensively while "bringing in the sheaves" of overwhelming yeses. (Wk. 7)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Area Development task force raises US\$2000 for the week, while ICA hosts government official at American Chamber's New Year's celebration feast.

Internal: Chinese exit procedures are outlined in detail and the House cleaned for Chinese New Year's week-long celebration.

Contradiction: Selecting a facility without having thought through the next ten and five years' plans. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: An unexpected visit by new U.S. ambassador to Philippines, David Newsome, on his first official trip to Cebu with a staff of 25 which included the USIS Directors for Manila and Cebu, honors village deeply. Secretary of Transportation for the Philippines initials road proposal "OK." Coca Cola sends out advertising team to design signs for every sari-sari store in the village. Two health caretakers begin full two-week training in village by regional health in stool and sputum analysis with new Lilly microscope. The largest workday ever attacks road and weeds and straightens and whitewashes rocks along two kilometers.

Internal: Ecclesiola, with 15 guests from St. Teresa's College, engages everyone... the structure works even when the only staff present are the two up front!

Contradiction: Contexting training (electrical, small engine repair, health, etc.) without promising a job. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: The weighing of 92 children and infants reveals 14 severely malnourished. The Red Cross donates four large bags of powdered milk for Nutrition Program. Nutrition classes with 20 participants initiates the Health Guild and Community Kitchen. The schedule of daily work days is consensed upon by the sitios (stakes) to dig the well and finish the Barangay Hall. Many signs are put up: Day Care Center, Mongo Beans, Tree Nursery, Demonstration Farm, Poultry Project, Community Kitchen, Health Center, Barangay Hall, General Store and a large Welcome sign. Seventy-six children attend the Day Care Center. ICA staff attends city mayor's dinner for the visiting American Ambassador to the Philippines who had visited Sudtonggan HDP on his way to Davao and made plans to visit Langub HDP on his next visit. The third group of Government Employee Rural Service workers since the Consult arrive - 13 men to fill out the Project working force.

Internal: Translators of the LHDP document, mostly faculty from the University of Mindanao, were honored at a Langub noon Guild Luncheon.

Contradiction: Keeping maneuver events in clear perspective while doing many tasks. (Wk. 7)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: House holds a GWF training session. Pepsicola donates 300,000 yen.

Internal: Korean visitors from Jeju Do visit the House and the Japanese farm training center, the Asian Rural Institute.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on momentum in registration and framing while having no clear model. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: HDTS workday constructs preschool road while the way is paved for two villagers to go to Japan for development. Shirley Mueller and Kim Won Ho journey to Seoul to plan national maneuvers and do two year audit.

Internal: W. Salmon picks up the sixth Global Language class making 35 hours per week and solving the catch-up Phase of "Fantastic Financial Functioning" on the "Markings of Magnificent Munificence Mobility."

Contradiction: Maintaining even relationships with the village while catalyzing the village to do the project. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The County Chief responsible for Kuh Du 2 Ri commits 12,000,000 won (US\$24,000) for the construction of a village hall for the consultation and the auxiliary housing while ICA:Korea submits a 1976-77 Finance Report and 1978 projection to the Ministry of Health and Social Affairs and Dr. Helen Chung travels to Kwangyung Il for the Education Panel of the HDTS.

Internal: House holds workshop on National Strategies, receives inkind kimchi and is impacted by the quarter's ecclesiola construct.

Contradiction: Making global-local polity work effectively and quickly. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House sets up three Imaginal Education Consults and three Global Women's Forums.

Internal: Sojourner moves in and House studies Imaginal Education paper.

Contradiction: Logistics and back-up system is overwhelmed by front-line demands for immediate deployment. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: The Kii Villages Town Meeting Maneuver teams "train" on Thursday, clarifying Japanese wording of the Challenges workshop, and visit the villages on the weekend, winning with a Town Meeting set in Ayama-cho, Mie Prefecture, two more possibles in two other prefectures, using a professionally designed poster given to ICA because it was "too expensive for us to pay for."

Internal: Caring for colleagues and for guest Jeju residents, Lee Yong Hwa and Koh Sung Uhn, cares for the while House.

Contradiction: Daring to shift from Town Meeting set-up to winning in Development and dancing through the Town Meetings. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: First Town Meeting Circuit (Chiiki Kondankai) in Hokkaido is on the road visiting five towns which were set up by the Social Education Department in Yubari City. Circuit team includes Mr. Tonosaki who is volunteering full-time while on school break. Oyubari English Conversation classes increase to 17, including a Jr. High English teacher who will be going to New York next year.

Internal: Michael Shaw returns from permeation assignment in Tokyo with a care package from the President of Sandoz, including medicines and a bottle of Johnny Walker Black Label.

Contradiction: Catalyzing grassroots activity for winter festival and local economic vehicle. (Wk. 7)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Walkabout team finally fords flooded rivers and walks into murrin bridge preparation and dalgetys. Major pastoral company gives nod to support. Nineteen Guardians from Sydney region attend Cconsult.

Internal: Youth cluster sutge out and raise \$60 towards May Oombulgarri Safari Trek.

Contradiction: Tturning interest into engagement while holding the tension between getting the job done and releasing the Movement to do the job. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: GWF core meets and lays groundwork for series of GWFs in March. Four families strongly affirm being on Committee of 1,000.

Internal: House welcomes three youth to new assignment, hosts Garnet Banks, Kim Thornton and Whites for the week and sends out Anne Clampeet to teach at OHDP.

Contradiction: Occasioning depth commitment through explosive use of time. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Week of final completion Corroborree preparation breaks loose inkind in all shapes and sizes in Darwin. Donor circuit picks up \$1,000 in first call and finds consultants

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN)

ready and willing for new Project. Five from Darwin attend Oombulgurri completion Corroborree.

Internal: After hosting Yallops on Corroborree preparation and donor circuit, White, Betonte, Norton, Yallops and four colleagues flying back from Oombulgurri are forced to land and are stranded at Port Keats Mission overnight showing radical contrast to Oombulgurri HDP.

Contradiction: Handling priority tasks in the midst of enforced waiting. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: January 26 Completion Corroborree is celebrated with 60 all-day guests transported in on the morning tide and out on the evening tide. From tours of the immaculately clean community, everyone gathered in the park for a luncheon feast of locally produced beef and pork. Following speeches there was ribbon cutting at new buildings - shower block, dairy, workshop, adult education building, airport/saddle/pig sheds, and Lungan Park—and festive corroboree dancing.

Internal: House hosts nine Walkabout Team guests, including Sam and Elkin Umbagai of Mowanjumb, for the week of the celebration and keynote guest speaker Bill Withers overnight. Contradiction: Confirming the hope that was born in completion and evidenced in stake meetings the following evening by giving structure to it. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Tim Wegner and Barry Oakley visit Gerard and set up first aboriginal Community Meeting in south Australia. Colleague who picks up CMA set-up material for the steering committee in his suburb leaves saying "We'll see you on the day." Invitations are designed and printed for GWF in Adelaide. Youth task force produces and distributes a comprehensive report on the January youth program.

Internal: The \$1,000 check from the Schools Commission for the planned May Oombulgurri youth trek arrives and is plugged into ICA finances.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary reshuffling of House space and office systems without slackening momentum. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Ten CMAs in the chute in Tasmania state-wide campaign are backed by Federal Minister for Community Housing and Environment, Apex, Rotary, Jaycees, Lions and women's groups. Three Oombulgurri Apprentices do Victoria mini-walkabout to Lake Tyres and then participate in guest night to thank donors to Workshop Completion.

Internal: House re-settlement accommodates Walkabout team, Apprentices, Development and more guests expected.

Contradiction: Pinning down the economic commitments that will sustain the mission on all fronts. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House participates in Corroborree celebration of OHDP completion with many prominent guests and long telegram from Prime Minister Fraser just as an invitation letter with 69 signatures from new aboriginal community wanting to begin immediately arrives.

Internal: As a result of the unexpected effectiveness of CTC, two-week impact and training construct with 46 participating from five nations and all regions of Area Sydney and many commitments for engagement being made, House spends week building replicable construct for Movement.

Contradiction: Building practical engagement forms for Guardians to accelerate three campaigns' programs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: House gives talks on GSD/GSF to four Bundaberg Rotary Clubs. Another batch of Walkabout aboriginal CMA workbooks is printed. March 18th is set for GWF. Over thirty letters are sent to South Brisbane groups to begin work on festival.

Internal: John Raper arrives and immediately picks up consultant role in painting community wall mural as John and Julie Miesen are sent out as educational task force to Oombulgurri.

Contradiction: Finding the futuristic ingredient missing from models. (Wk. 7)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

External: Radical support of the Emporium is demonstrated with a letter from the District Administrator of the Marshalls inviting government employees to participate, radio announcements and the TV manager demanding his free community announcement.

Internal: Hale Prather arrives in time to help tape songs for the Emporium loudspeaker as sodality in ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Developing hard core leadership. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Over 100 attend "International Year of the Child" meeting to discern needs of children in Western Samoa and draft proposals for 1979. Ed Higgins is appointed to national commission to represent ICA in this United Nations sponsored program which has three million dollars available for 1978 set-up.

Internal: Job comes to A. Kovate unexpectedly as colleague asks "Looking for a job? come in Monday."

Contradiction: Finding a way through many possibilities to the objectives of GCF and HDP. (Wk. 7)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: House receives 23 letters and three long distance phone calls in response to an article in the current American Veterinary Journal about Guardians participation in GSD projects, from veterinarians who want to know how they can participate.

Internal: Front line circuit troops return to share battle wisdom in "Taking Care of Yourself" collegium.

Contradiction: Making the leap from smoothly ongoing daily patterns to the strategies that will make three new area GSD projects a reality in the next four months. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Final clean-up of San Jose House readies it for sale. Eight buyers want House and good deal is set for December 15.

Internal: Attendance of San Jose women at the Global Womens Forum and interior decision are key events of GWF on peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating the practical forms for missional task of the metro cadre. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Weekend California Planning Meeting is held in Oak Park Church, with all meals and for motels inkinded. The key 11 maneuvers for California focus on Development, HDP preparation and impact.

Contradiction: Developing a metro cadre manual that holds tension between comprehensive and particular. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Internal: The chaos of the new House is given order as everything finds its place.

Contradiction: Keeping finishing touches of settling in (decor and personal space) to the edges while getting back to external mission as major focus. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: The worst rain storm in Southern California history does not dampen spirits of participants as second Santa Margarita Town Meeting unites community destiny by forming a local service district.

Internal: A full House with collegiums on charting and Chinese firecrackers and dragons bring new meaning and insight to old habits.

Contradiction: Dynamiting the log jam so that Projects can move rapidly to fruition. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Ten TMs are held in New Mexico.

Internal: Week II serves to stage 24-hour drama of fanatical dedication as new House is painted until 4:00 a.m. and House cat is nursed back to health.

Contradiction: Finding new tactics to deal with major block of paving and plumbing for the new House. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Orchestrators for the Lapoint, Utah, Town Meeting trek north through a mountain blizzard to steer the Rocky Mountain TM avalanche into Wyoming.

Internal: Area prior, Bob Vance, visits and impacts House with intensity of demand of the North America GSD schedule.

Contradiction: Maintaining avalanche speed in the face of mountain winter weather, the "effulgence flu" and geographic spread. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

Internal: Week-long snow storm allows youth a week of vacation from school and gives lots of hours to spend with the Gilberts and work on indoor tasks.

Contradiction: Enabling local people to pick up responsibility for community programs and structure. (Wk. 7)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Metro framing reveals readiness for engagement.

Internal: Edmonton Area has Minneapolis surrounded as House members are employed for self-support - delivering papers, driving taxis, and working in downtown offices around the clock.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Delta Sigma Theta, national Black sorority, invites House to speak at their Houston chapter meeting in March. Rick Loudermilk sets up LENS Seminar with Hughes Tool Company. Manager at Hughes asks casually, "Oh, by the way, can you do a Town Meeting for 5,000 people? We want all of our employees to participate."

Internal: Dana Dirickson lands a job with legal firm downtown and Claire Taylor writes intriguing resume.

Contradiction: Setting up North and Central Texas maneuvers while at the same time mopping up South and West Texas counties. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Lone Star Stampede continues with 15 TMs. House troops support TM New Mexico thrust of Area San Francisco in Melrose, New Mexico.

Internal: Quests continue to show up at ecclesiola and Lenten observance begins with Shrovetide crepes and evening Ash Wednesday Daily Office.

Contradiction: Solidifying corporate focus in the midst of experiencing intensified scatteredness. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Lone Star Stampede enters third week of circuits in the six-week maneuver with 14 dates set on southern front.

Internal: Tom and Connie Greyshock arrive from Lorne to pick up new assignment. San Antonio business community continues to make maneuver planning and debriefing Week IIs great events at mealtimes.

Contradiction: Going back to old territory when the new is beckoning. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Colleagues meet around the table to design format for the Oklahoma Report. Towns are sending snapshots and reports on the followup to Town Meeting: Oklahoma 100.

Internal: Two House members return from a month of stomping in Texas during the Lone Star Stampede.

Contradiction: Discerning the timing for detonating the charges that have been set in place through TM. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Los Altos Town Meeting in Mexican barrio of Dallas proves to be a lively event with promise of follow-up on proposals. One hundred forty-eight of Texas 254 counties have had or have scheduled a Town Meeting. Appointment with Xerox regional office results in an invitation to submit a proposal for a one-day training event for XCIP chairmen in two states.

Internal: Collegiums using Exemplar brooding screen continue to be helpful investigations of profound humanness.

Contradiction: Preparing for the Lone Star Stampede as it heads this direction. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: A proposal is submitted to EDA at their request, accompanied by four Pace citizens beginning a course in small business management. Final decision is made on annexation area in comprehensive plan.

Internal: The celebration of the completed life of Barbara Joan Smith takes place on Saturday, January 28, with whole House's integral participation in both practices and drama.

Contradiction: Focusing action in visible miracles while simultaneously doing necessary long-range tactics. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

Internal: House obtains a three-hour night job that almost reaches the self-support goal.

Internal: Booher and Gooch put flesh on logistics as two cars are inked for two weeks.

Contradiction: Finishing Western Tennessee while Mississippi goes yellow. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: The Atlanta House works with the area patrol team to create the model and initiate visits that will move the Atlanta Region toward becoming a major source for developing funds. House receives its first significant contribution ever in the form of a \$500 check from the Trust Company Banks of Georgia.

Contradiction: Breaking open self-support so that another circuit team can get on the road. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: The second wave of town set-up is completed with 13 of a 15-county block scheduled for next week. Success breeds success as Burrough contributes \$300 and Nancy Reynolds (tobacco) gives \$5,000 for TMs in North Carolina.

Internal: Youth cluster is engaged in TM staffing, readying TM orchestration packets and baking cookies.

Contradiction: Receiving God's chosen as colleagues. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: House combines circuit south with visit with colleagues and House Church in West Palm Beach. Seven TMs happen on schedule, including Citrus County.

Internal: Talking face to face with colleagues existentially freshens the definition of collegiality.

Contradiction: Maintaining a base of operation while it is necessary to be away most of the time. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Nexus sends out three additional special forces to Latin America for site selection, authorization and framing. Publishing House prepares Tactical Action Book in two languages for the Projects in India. Work continues on the U.S. 12 expansion. Nexus troops show up in five different states on GCF campaign maneuvers.

Internal: Collegium on ecclesiola construct sparks creativity and adds to Thursday night celebrational dynamic.

Contradiction: Responding creatively to tight cash flow situation while keeping all programs spinning. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Simultaneous attack is made on contradiction from many fronts: Development \$8,000 in hand and breakthrough in local TM funding; 5th citizens rebuild community center boiler and do economic intensification trek in Ivy City; Iron Man statue is presented to senator Percy and H.U.D. releases major funding for housing development.

Internal: Verdell Trice returns from Ivy City trek ecstatic with new possibility.

Contradiction: Internalizing corporate HDP completion plan and global reporting of methods. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Lone circuiter holds six TMs with a high attendance of 78 and a low of 17, averaging 40 per TM for the week as two permeators pack decor for next TMs and type letters for next campaign.

Internal: Wanda Gammel arrives to help with typing blitz, bringing along pictures and letter from daughter in Cano Negro.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on the breakloose with a three-man House. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Cooperative Development effort opens doors to Roman Catholic Orders, new adopt-a-village churches, Chamber of Commerce access to key corporate and religious leadership and Guardian and patron involvement, while contacts begin in 20 counties for two TM assemblies.

Internal: House and Development team celebrate victory at local pub where House is regaled with stories of sea cucumbers, shark fishing, and other adventures of HDP formulation.

Contradiction: Building victory stories that embody reality and disclose future possibility. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: House meshes 49 Development calls across Missouri with TMs being held, capitalizing on nearby TMs held and scheduled.

Internal: House celebrates the Missouri Waltz campaign around a fireplace preumed for six years to be nonfunctioning, releasing the troops to view the globe through Walt and Pam Blood's report on Majuro and Kate St. Clair's report on Global Women's Forum.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in the face of a shift in troops strength while turning toward Kansas. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The second workshop of GWF particularizes the global in a new refreshing way through individual and then corporate brooding on time designs.

Internal: Antigone conversation in ecclesiola (nothing but the ship and the storm having a name) grounds the solitariness of each decision.

Contradiction: Enabling people to see anew that no structures, assignments, nor "George" can care for a community, a company or a House. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Missouri Waltz Campaign completion is celebrated in a fantastic style with colleagues from Kansas City, Chicago, Kentucky and the region. Yellow Missouri Waltz Tee-shirts and Campaign Model Document are key events. Sunday evaluation with GCF post provides helpful clarity. Campaign development money begins to come in. Nine more TMs are done out of House, bringing state total to 84 counties done, 31 to go. Breakthrough on GWF plans happens as University of Missouri Extension consultant with 1,000 women on mailing list gets interested.

Internal: Regional colleagues bring record player, champaign and layer cake topped with Missouri outline to Waltz Campaign celebration.

Contradiction: Keeping the spirit momentum after the climax of the Missouri campaign while creating the next maneuver. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: House sets up 12 TMs and holds seven, bringing the total to 78 either held or scheduled. A bulk mailing to 200 banks asking for \$25 for Town Meeting; Iowa brings in \$150 the first week. February TM newsletter is sent to printers.

Internal: House celebrates Joshua Krauss's fifth birthday with "Star Wars" rocket cake, a great event for House and local preschool.

Contradiction: Completing basic arrangements for the Town Meeting Assembly in the midst of the last major set-up week to complete the 99 counties. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: House sends out TM invitations to 66 mayors in 22 counties.

Internal: Seven families join three House families for ecclesiola and site research.

Contradiction: Activating 200 potential orchestrators to finish Wisconsin in two weeks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Bimetro cadre plans Guardian events for therest of the quarter.

Internal: Rick Luedke celebrates his birthday at House Church by bringing a cake with grids of Cano Negro and Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Grounding Town Meetings in the lives of metro colleagues when the battlefield is so far away. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The three campaigns continue to dance as eight women from across the metro gather for a GWF PSU and create a set-up manual for new locations. TM: Indiana stationary is completed and MTST time inkinded with IBM in Indianapolis through Louisville office. Ft. Wayne slide show sets up a serious village adoption possibility. Check for \$2,500 is received for TMs held.

Internal: Pre-Lenten fasting and feasting lays bare the greatness of situation as House and metro celebrate the first fast of the year.

Contradiction: Extending death ground, even unto those places upon which the blizzard doth blow. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Phone calles to colleagues and letter of authorization from the president of the Glenmary Fathers Home missionarys opens vision of Kentucky advance. Over 200 invitations to Evening at the Institute enable the updating of the mailing list.

Internal: Blizzard victim, Don Bushman, is stranded here for three days; he enables thorough Kentucky battleplan.

Contradiction: Getting the traction to move out after the big snow. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Three TMs are held. Len Hockley opens authorization and Development doors by visiting old family friends. Three teams grid an area of Detroit in preparation for Town Meetings.

Internal: Moving on self-support thorough search for job, grant, and a new facility happens in one week.

Contradiction: Catalyzing troop engagement in all areas, regionally and continentally. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Symbolic of this week's mission was the one-day Toledo Tornado which initiated the Bryan TM. House sends out invitations to two other TMs.

Internal: Kay Hayes, Martha Talbott and Bob St. Clair pass through from Ivy City acceleration and share a great collegium on the do-ment of the 24.

Contradiction: Mustering the troops from the great white frozen spaces of Ohio. (Wk. 7)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Six special focus TMs are scheduled for "Loisaida" setting the stage for the community-wide conference, a climax for Challenge for Those Who Dare cadre.

Internal: Collegium which lays out a model for three HDP Projects to be initiated by June marks a shift in the year's emphasis from setting up TMs to setting up HDPs.

Contradiction: Setting up a winning maneuver for Development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: The Samurai visit results in identification of future consultants for HDPs and possibility of local congregation Adopt-a-village.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality releases non-residents and first time guests to deal with space symbolically.

Contradiction: Building the vision that releases the revolutionary spirit in local activity. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Nine House members, along with three colleagues, travel to Ivy City for continental workday and division meetings.

Internal: "Blessings" happen when water pipe bursts one day before the major snowstorm.

Contradiction: Pushing aside the excuses of no way to get there. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Inmates and correctional authorities at Powatown Correctional Institution get ready for their second TM. Virginia TM Assembly site is set in Fredericksburg.

Internal: Self-support is boosted by one more in House employed full time.

Contradiction: Engaging new field contacts in the campaigns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: The first floor of the Community Center reopens with program and preschool open house as preschool moves into four new classrooms.

Internal: Ash Wednesday fast day sets tone for journey through Lent.

Contradiction: Moving as the solitaries in the midst of the corporate without falling into the trap of individualism. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Telephone calls throughout the state increase promises of TM Assembly attendance as registrations continue to arrive.

Internal: Participation in New York area workday in Ivy City and Town Meeting debriefing session for Northern and Southern Division brings GSD and GCF closer together.

Contradiction: Ensuring adequate representation from each county at state Town Meeting Assembly. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Sixteen Town Meetings are held in Pennsylvania as a prelude to assemblies on Saturday.

Internal: Adopt-a-village collegium releases new possibilities for Assembly and Development.

Contradiction: Building deeper collegial engagement required to shift from doing the counties to county saturation and GSD expansion. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Seven colleagues and House join 100 Others in Ivy City for the greatest work day ever, heralding the urband living environment shift.

Internal: Shrove Tuesday brings a fat celebration the night before fast day, as House dresses up to play the role secretly regarded with fear and fascination.

Contradiction: Setting up a winning situation for Development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: The Northern Division strike force joins the battalions for county saturation.

Internal: Outstanding collegium on GSF, Kawangware HDP and Imaginal Education and Brain Development nurture the few remaining House troops.

Contradiction: Trusting that the clarity relative to the post-golding maneuvers will come in the midst of the doing. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: The Hartford and Boston Houses and colleagues converge on Rutland County, Vermont, and visit ten towns in a county saturation maneuver.

Internal: A visit by a Development team results in the decision of Paul Evans to embark on a three-CONSult trek to Africa and Europe.

Contradiction: Creating a new plan for colleague engagement in county saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

288, External: Community youth program director, Joe Reid, and Lions club official, Jim Kent, meet to plan a Community Youth Forum for Albany's Arbor Hill area. TM followthrough is initiated with visit to newly elected town supervisor who affirms the value of TM for launching his administration. Field logistics and GSF engagement are launched; Linda Brock is sent to Rochester to work Day I with House in launching visitation.

Internal: Rosemary Kennedy leave for week to enable Pennsylvania TMs, leaving one permeator behind.

Contradiction: Maintaining all maneuvers at maximum momentum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Boston's snowstorm of the century releases entire House to a full week of Day I time, resulting in over 30 women committed to attend the GWF by massive phoning blitz done on Campaign Night.

Internal: The House, confined for a full week due to blizzard, barely escapes cabin fever by trudging out to a fine movie, "Turning Point."

Contradiction: Releasing the clog-up of printing deliveries while dealing with cancelled appointments and transportation difficulties caused by the snowstorm. (Wk. 7)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Excellent response to recruitment calling for Community Youth Forum is an added sign of victory as almost half of the CFCs for Quebec are held or set up for the week covering 4/5 of the geography and doubling the number of set-ups for any one week. Royal Bank supports CFCs in Canada to the tune of \$10,000.

Internal: Circuiters celebration is enhanced with numerous victory banners hanging from the ceiling and names of CFCs held and set are attractively displayed in free-form shaped posters covering one wall of the collegium room. Activity for the night was finger painting scenes from the circuits.

Contradiction: Making best use of present resources and those being uncovered day by day. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of House is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Bless the GSF. Local colleague plays servant role to enable orchestration of CFC, as chauffeur, meal host, set-up and production man, and returns home singing.

Internal: House redecides to carry weight of area campaign by structuring enablement to compensate for one less troop.

Contradiction: Securing a quick victory before the springs wind down completely. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: The training dynamic explodes in the community with the beginning of the Training Academy for Community Leadership and the sendout of two members of the community to do CFCs in the Gaspé.

Internal: House celebrates Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday and begins Lent with a new large bulletin board.

Contradiction: Keeping the community's reaction to chaos from becoming the operating context for the Project. (Wk. 7)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Foro Comunitarios are held in La Curia and La Iglesia El Redemptor, spanning rural Venezuela and the city of Caracas. New Cano Negro team member gives powerful half-hour report on the Foro and the need to have more workshop leaders from the village. Women's Week in the village opens with Women's Foro and ends with a miracle day featuring a tea and reflection on the week. Guilds prepare practical presentations and workshops in stakes ranging from plaza design workshops to first aid classes and "A Day at the Preschool." Stakes bubble over with new curriculum. Agricultural Guild transplants 2,000 papaya trees for commercial garden.

Internal: Jim Kelly arrives to head up development efforts for Latin American expansion and the HDTS. House reworks maneuvers after expansion team leaves to integrate HDTS maneuvers with completion timeline.

Contradiction: Breaking through routine in village to announce the home stretch of completion. (Wk. 7)

The breakthrough comes in the willingness of support from the church. The contradiction lies in the arena of developing strategy to utilize local troops to maximize effectiveness of metro circuits.

Global Research Centrum reports that the screen for the last in the series of three Journals for this year was created and includes contributions from Kaunda and Aeschylus. CYF in Montreal comes off with magic, a forceful happening against the background of the Canadian national struggle. The Centrum begins exploring the "Theology of Sociality," or a way of developing a set of screens for talking about the dynamics of the social process through the categories of the Encounter, the Possibility, Responsibility and Primal Community. The contradiction is in the arena of seeing through the immediate practical missional demands to the long-range, the profound and the visionary level of missional engagement that maintains momentum.

Global Operations Centrum reports the return of CTC participants to Malaysia and Indonesia, giving trained personnel in GCF methods and local language to actuate maneuvers. With West Virginia and Alaska Town Meetings done, the 50th state is 50% done. Four consultants are sent to the Kapini Consult in Zambia. Kate St. Clair launches GWF in Australia. Bob Lingafelter leaves for Jamaica with Latin American site selection team. The momentum of victory catalyzes early brooding on what is beyond Summer '78. The contradiction lies in the arena of operating in the safety of old patterns to meet clear targets in the midst of a demand for another quantum leap while synchronizing all the pieces of the three campaigns.
