Regional council is joined at lunch by project work force, making 42 around the table. Colleagues make definite commitments to TM and Development.

Internal: CharityBanda sojourns after academy.

Contradiction: Developing a community entity to pursue all the new openings that are emerging in both the social and the economic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW
 External: Planning for next quarter is hammered out in 44-hour Week Two of review and preview of Scotland maneuver.

Internal: In the midst of writing a new song, colleague's words to the same tune arrive, merging miraculously into a potential Year of U.K. top ten chart buster.

Contradiction: Standing in the tension of accelerating the Year of the U.K. Town Meeting campaign in Scotland while broadening the attack on the other fronts throughout the area (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL
 External: Visit with the Queen's Council, Speak of the House of Commons, secures his support for work in Wales and the U.K. Patrols do 44 development calls in Wales.

Internal: House celebrates Stuart Wright's eighth birthday.

Contradiction: Becoming one of the "clubs" informal funding networks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER
 External: Five Newcastle youth pay toward deposit for a week summer program at Termine.

Internal: Care fir sefk (priorship training) and structure (office and painting) are infused with excitement in planning 12 days of Christmas Odyssey.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS
 External: Brittany circuit sets three Town Meetings and possible department funding.

Internal: Annex space arranged in monastery next door allows resettlement which houses all. Popcorn and Vin Chaud enable the celebration and trimming the Christmas tree.

Contradiction: Catching up all systems to missional edge. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP
 External: The Termine Comitato (Secretariat) consenses on its officers. Three women join the knitting co-op for a total of seven. Four chests are sold from the carpentry shop. Pre-schoolers receive red and green g badges as symbols. Six development proposals are written by the Rome contingent.

Internal: Auxiliary visits stakes delivering Christmas cards and receiving gifts of head cheese, and cracklings. A stake card is made for every person in Termine.

Contradiction: Giving villagers a way to tell the story that they are a demonstration. (Wk. 12)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP
 External: Project accelerates toward "lights on" by clarifying the electrical system. Staff locates a .52.5 generator for industry at 50% discount and the National Electric Power Authority donates a copy of their recent survey map which clears up questions about road systems.

Internal: House purchases new Vespa with insurance check from old wrecked one.

Contradiction: Keeping up December push in the midst of

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Two Nexus meetings are held following Continental Council pushing through implications for Quarter III and revealing requirements for ordinary and for extraordinary responses.

Internal: Liveliness of all meetings turning work into sheer spirit has become the normal during this Advent season.

Contradiction: Completing battleplanning before next quarter amid holiday dispersement. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: A county-wide steering committee begins planning January 13 TMs in and around the former capitol of Limburg to launch the Year of the Village.

Internal: Collegiums continue to be stellar, symbolized with collegium on Limburg TM maneuver.

Contradiction: Doing transrational planning that gets everything done. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House hosts six Guardians for dinner. Adrie Nortier returns from six months in Kelapa Dua and is strong colleague. Follow-up visit and letters maintain development momentum for January.

Internal: Week II of scribbling and rug shampooing is climaxed by the Emerging Generation hanging the greens. Evenings are marked by corporate preparation for area council.

Contradiction: Pulling off a fine December without a clear picture of the victories of January. (Wk. 12)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The visit of the American Ambassador to Germany, Walter Stoessel, and his wife caps a year of increasing public visibility for the Kreuzberg Ost Human Development Project. To top off the week, one of the major Berlin dailies devotes the back page of its first section to Kreuzberg Ost on January 1, 1978.

Internal: House keeps busy between Christmas and New Year's preparing for the Ambassador's visit plus a New Year's celebration.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to win with the decision of long-term commitment and engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: U.S. ambassador's visit to the Project is firmed up for December 27. Wednesday evening guild conversation is led by one of the guilders, symbolizing the emerging decision of the community to take over the Project leadership.

Internal: House children are scared out of their wits as Rich Michael becomes Santa at House Christmas party. Reflection on Development reveals the necessity for a consistent push on Development with people from the community being involved.

Contradiction: Forging the concrete images to implement a broad picture of the future. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big

fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS ois on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradictuib: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers tha assure victory. (WK. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water tower at eight meters, urban circuit delivers 1000 in Egyptian pounds in best week yet. Staff inkinds Babert (earth mover) for one month, three hundred bags of cement, generator. Maadi Womens Club delivers 500 Egyptian pounds for womens industry and designs village workbook. Signal visit with local Sheik promise land release for irrigation. Pre-school teachers organize drive to get roof on pre-school. Guild prepare weekly "voice". Tea with Lady Marie, British Ambassador's wife, opens another network.

Internal: House receives village family as sojourners.

Contradiction: Discerning the concrete arenas for focus when everyting seems to be ready. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: The Great Two Years celebration includes the Kawangware Fair sponsored by the programs of KHDP; the official opening of two new industires of the Kawangware Cooperative Society, Kawatex (sewing industry) and the Kawangware Metal Shop, by the Deputy Commisioner of Coops, Mr. Wanyonyi, the official opening of the low-cost murram house by Her Excellency, Miss Margaret Kenyatta, a farm field day with a feast that included rabbit from the farm, a great workday followed by an outdoor film, and a grand celebration day in the Kawangware Square which included the Kenya Administration Police Band, a parade, community speakers, and the fine guest speaker, Mr. Motiga from the office of the Vice President of Kenya.

Internal: Regular evening conversations are bracketed due to exciting reflective conversations on breaklooses during "Great Two Years" in Kawangware celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring that the community's journey of walking on water continues. (Wk. 12)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: Press reporters visit at instigation of State Bank of India. Guardian hosts two demonstration visits. Largest Continental Council held with a total of 314 assigned to Nava Gram Prayas as HDTs graduates 114 students-largest yet. Preschool Training Module begins in Maliwada for 10 days.

Internal: Health Acceleration Team sent out to Vaviharsh Health Training Module.

Contradiction: Aligning auxiliary and village in preparing for Quarter III battleplanning. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: City Bank runs quarter page advertisement highlighting Maliwada project in major India papers. Tata's Taj Mahal Hotel makes the first installment on Chikhale sponsorship. House meets the vice-president of the Century

Rayons who shows keen interest in sponsoring a village.

Internal: Christmas Eve is celebrated with dinner the treats thirty-one souls to the fines Keralaite feast, exchange of gifts, carol singing and the arrival of Hemalatha and Kavitha James from Calcutta.

Contradiction: Establishing the interior modes for Ashram Operations which will enable devising the service structures to meet the needs of the explosion of Nava Gram Prayas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: In village shramdam, preshcool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI -KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industires meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: GWF with 26 elite women gives new authorization base.

Internal: Swirl of guests for GWF and development happens. Marie Paul goes to Chandigarh to enable Dethe family after the death of Monini's sister, Rohini.

Contradiction: Refocusing energy after GWF breakthrough. (Wk. 11)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLACUTTA

External: GWF in Calcutta YWCA comes off with 30 present. First reactions are encouraging.

Internal: House members move into new facility, its location ideal for building on past PCE work as well as being a jumping-off point for Development and the Eastern India Village HDP.

Contradiction: Doing the external mission in midst of immediacies of sustenance of survival. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House contexts and is contexted by the economic acceleration team on its way to Sungai Lui and Kelapa Dua. Management trek begins in Australia.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS)

Internal: House hosts visitors from the area, Chicago and one from Singapore who contacted the ICA when a friend told her "They are doing what you want to do."

Contradiction: Broadening one's engagement in order to be consumed by three campaigns instead of one. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: Colleagues from East Malaysia visit about authorization maneuvers in Sarawak. September launch of Development secures \$6,700.

Internal: Intensive battleplan for year is tackled as Wiltse family arrives.

Contradiction: Forging clarity on the future of Southeast Asia and how the centrum dynamic will be supportive. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Many and varied activities keep people of the village and the auxiliary busy as they clean irrigation ditches to padi field, hold Imaginal Education Course in Port Dixon for the Tadika teachers, divert river to prepare for the dam building. Women of the village engage in the first industry, gloves. A new English teacher is recruited, demonstration garden is started and the game of badminton flourishes as the youth sports program gets underway.

Internal: House welcomes three sojourners, sends three staff out to teach Indicative Process Methods to women's division of the Malaysia Trades Union Congress in Malacca, and sends Michael Gordon-Smith back to Australia and the Economic Intensification Trek on to Indonesia.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum after Eco-trek as different colleagues move in and out of the village. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Fifteen visit the HDP, including governments, Dutch, U.S., Canada. Health care classes continue in three stakes. Fifteen women take trip to zoo. English classes with 25 happen two times per week. Film on Saturday brings in 200 people; 30 attend agricultural class.

Internal: House sends out Ruthe and George Yost for visa renewal to Singapore.

Contradiction: Maintaining full-time development thrust and training village and auxiliary in priorship at the same time. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Letter of permission from Internal Security and Governor's Office opens wide the doors in village search and data gathering rapidly increases. GWF brochures and proposal is translated and delivered toto women's organizations. Weekend is highlighted with Christmas open house for ITI colleagues and friends, one bringing seven daughters to provide drama and singing.

Internal: Collegiums come alive as basic strategy is formulated. Christmas green are brought back from village search in Karo Highlands.

Contradiction: Operating as if priorities six and nine are only concern while having to wait for final village location. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Centrum hosts 20 from Area Hong Kong for Area Hong Kong Council; 40 participate in Hong Kong GWF.

Internal: House welcomes Carol Pierce, Joyce Quimby and Aimee Hilliard for GWF. Bob Fishel and Isabel Bishop

arrive en route from Maliwada HDTS to Seoul HDTS. Dolly Rowe secures job.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum on all fronts. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Nam Wai English class celebrates end of quarter with Saturday night barbeque at nearby park. Work begins on large mural on wall of village building depicting Nam Wai's past and future. Hakka Heritage guild (village Elders) sponsor and host village celebration which includes visiting elders group that performed Chinese opera, the Nam Wai children's choir and Hakka songs by village elders. Elders donate \$300 (HK) in proceeds from lottery toward sending villagers to Korean HDTS.

Internal: House spends week planning winning maneuvers for the coming quarter.

Contradiction: Dealing with village internal life complexities in order to avoid delay in the formation of development corporation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Villages take pride in village as they pick up on beautification with planting and watering flowers and trees and sweeping the main street so that Hai Ou can be the Hawaii of Taiwan. Guild meeting is success with 20 people around the table and economic-based format brings excited discussion.

Internal: House welcomes John Slicker back from the U.S. All are getting in the Christmas spirit baking cookies, making decorations and singing Advent songs.

Contradiction: Finishing this quarter with a bang while next quarter is already upon us. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Development gets half the month's goal on the first day of the month.

Internal: Audrey Ayers stops by en route to the economic acceleration trek in Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Laying the creative ground work to launch Quarter III' (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House sends out Pat Despain, the Odens and the economic acceleration team to Hai Ou trek. Guardian visits Hai Ou and ups loan from 100,000 to 150,000 (US\$4,000). Cargill, Taiwan, is willing to help set up an animal raising industry in Hai Ou and will guarantee profit through low feed price.

Internal: Christmas celebration, economic acceleration team send-out and study of Hai Ou economic proposals mark the beginning of the Christmas-New Year season.

Contradiction: Coordinating specific demands to generate momentum and motivity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Community Assembly commissions Sudtonggan HDP Corporation, the six corporation founders and the nine trustees as well as 20 health caretakers and 20 school aides. Economic barriers are broken through as rope and rock contracts are confirmed along with buri factory materials donated and delivered. Rock cutting demonstration success on same day as windmill installation and receipt of three miles of mainline wire from Manila company for village electrification spin village into week of quarterly planning.

Internal: Process of writing quarterly program report, having sent out half of House on other missions, enables new perspectives and creativity.

Contradiction: Grounding the emerging shift from vague images of project completion as "leaving" to 100% self-support, increased participation and skilled management. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Community support for the Langub HDP becomes visible as families bring cogon (tall grass) and bamboo by the cart load. Site excavation for the Barangay Hall (Consult location) is completed with community labor. House surveys 165 households as Colonel Gatmaitan, Davao city police, gives endorsement for project.

Internal: Discontinuity begins with fine Christmas party in Langub with British and German Guardian guests.

Contradiction: Focusing corporate energy on the major priorities so momentum continues to build. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Prior takes youth group to Oyubari as forerunner of tourist industry. Radio program, magazine article and newspaper articles about Oyubari work are all positive and helpful.

Internal: Christmas celebration jams 75 guests into House, mixing day workers and authorization figures.

Contradiction: Integrating areal battleplan with regional battleplan with troops gone. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Villagers come to training center to help prepare the floors for cementing after the heat pipes are installed. The plasterer comes and spends two nights to finish his job on the floors. The manager's house at the chicken farm is begun. TMs are temporarily postponed while authorization calls at all levels of government are made. Preschool teachers build next quarter's curriculum during vacation with the aid of prepared copies from Chicago. The community health caretakers take over the operation of the bath house.

Internal: Christmas celebration begins at 10:00 p.m. following the completion of cementing the training center floors and the exchange of gifts.

Contradiction: Securing the authorization at all levels which will give permission to move in village development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Vice Governor and Saemaul Kwajang of Jeju do return from trip to the HDPs in the United States, deeply excited and prepared to help with major authorization work in preparation for the HDTs. Grassroots development explodes with money coming in from all parts of the country.

Internal: Monday morning collegium on the church year and the significance of Advent is helpful for all. The first snow of the year comes and temporarily brings the city to a halt.

Contradiction: Keeping the faith while waiting for death ground to be made clear. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: A week of circuit riding gives key leads on sites and colleagues to set up PLC, HRM and a GWF in the Naha metro and new contacts with English teachers in Hiroshima metro.

Internal: One of guild members visits to fete House with a special tea ceremony in the midst of first of two battleplanning sessions.

Contradiction: Being able to meet the demand with staff and models when a breakloose happens. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Town Meeting in Awaji begins preparation of island leadership for further Town Meetings. Development breakthrough: school Christmas party is scheduled with promised gift of \$400 for Oyubari.

Internal: New miracle board excites House as miracles pop up daily.

Contradiction: Driving down the stakes of two TMs set for this week while shooting the arrows that will assure that the TM torch gets passed. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Sapporo cross country ski course is visited while exploration for local ski course is expanded. Physical survey forms are distributed for daily stake walk checks. Stake maps and decor are prepared for stake meetings. Battleplan is built for Early Learning Center, with opening scheduled in January, 1978. On Wee II, 40 towns are visited by five circuit teams to break open TM in Hokkaido.

Internal: New assignment formate into guild arenas maximizes program expansion. Thanksgiving party with local residents introduces new customs. Three new jobs are obtained for self-support.

Contradiction: Pushing through Project programs and area maneuvers with troops on hand. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: News from the Council record number of CMAs held, shift into state campaigns amidst new birth in authorization, Walkabout Team completes the northern circuit with CMAs to aboriginal communities, and record development for quarter of 46,000 will be increased to 50,000 by the end of the quarter.

Internal: Bob and Judy White arrive in Sydney to take up new September assignment. Jim Bishop visits, Ken Wiltz arrives on Management trek. House Christmas party celebrates with riotous Australian fun.

Contradiction: Forging the new HDPs and campaigns that intensify the possibilities. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: House nails down three new people for CTC (summer program) and now has some men registered. "Operation Corroboree" invitations to celebration at Oombulgurri of beginning of next phase of Oombulgurri development are mailed and of Perth Stock Exchange is visited.

Internal: Those attending CTC are sent out as Grandma Rees is welcomed for Christmas.

Contradiction: Winning with last minute prospects with whom there is no way to give a full context. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: "\$430 catch" says there must be more out there. Oombulgurri completion gain momentum.

Internal: School breaks for long summer holidays.

Contradiction: Maintaining a vision beyond immediate irritations and annoyances. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: First Aboriginal CMA demonstrates competence in use of methods and deep excitement over new song.

Internal: Visit from Operation Walkabout team with fresh image of Community Meetings for aboriginals impacts all.

Two luxuries arrive in the form of motorcycles, sparking new life.

Contradiction: Creating effective forms that allow community participation in Operation Completion. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Core meeting sets dates for two GWFs in country and city and makes search for locations and organization contacts. Early morning contacts with Teachers College result in flood of phone calls a few hours later from teachers. Work on CTC summer program enlistment and Oombulgurri completion continues.

Internal: Tim and Sue Wegner, Kimberley Smith and Michelle Telford are sent to participate in Area Council in Sydney.

Contradiction: Learning to be the other in any situation that will release decisions to participate in the three campaigns. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Ad in newspaper for Oombulgurri teachers produces interviews with three families looking for a new way to engage their lives. Major funding grants for \$10,000 arrive for Operation Walkabout.

Internal: Operation Ship-shape inkinds four portable file cases and mobilizes midnight corporate blitz to help ready books for audit.

Contradiction: Claiming the discontinuity that will allow all to enter 1978 as young lions. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Ken Wiltse completes management trek in Canberra and finishes moving Management Centrum to Singapore. Area council in Sydney plans for coming months. Walkabout begins in New South Wales with six communities visited. California TM grad, Virginia Perry, and John and Lynda Cock join Walkabout staff for few days of experience in aboriginal Community Meetings.

Internal: Key Guardians' son, Michael Gordon-Smith, returns from Sungai Lui after six months.

Contradiction: Building concrete implementaries and plans that enable completion of Oombulgurri by January 26. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Christmas party is held in newly painted collegium room. Guests overflowed in 100 degree heat. CTC registration stands at six registered and five yeses. George Alcorn says yes to going to Oombulgurri for completion celebration.

Internal: House welcomes Kim Thornton, Kim and Lisa Smith for Christmas. House plans corporate celebration as Phase I goes carolling all over city.

Contradiction: Using the trust built in local colleagues to turn them into Movemental colleagues. (Wk. 12)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

External: House gets ready to "march ahead into history" with the launching of the Showplace on January 7 by preparing a mobile preschool and mobile stake and guild decor, inviting 25 community colleagues for New Year's Eve, and a continual bombardment of news articles about TMs, the Showplace and stakes and guilds coming out in every edition of the local Marshallese newspaper, "The Journal," complete with photos and grids.

Internal: House has fine Christmas celebration feast,

highlighted by a band from the Republic of Nauru as guests, initiating a back and forth dialogue of singing and heightening awareness of being Area Suva.

Contradiction: Finding, catalyzing and training stake leadership. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Metro cadre does Tom Sawyer with 21 people as traffic circle is transformed into flower garden. Dr. Vio Annandale, who on trip to Manila visits with ICA staff and hears story on Sudtonggan HDP, returns to add to authorization for Western Samoa HDP.

Internal: House sends out Douglas Curts to U.S. as Aaoge Kovati moves into House with suitcase, having returned from Ivy City by way of Chicago Nexus.

Contradiction: Shifting energy from immediate HDP Consult to GCF without losing ground gained. (Wk. 12)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: New Year's Eve celebration brings together 46 people from San Jose, Sacramento and San Francisco metros for a fine evening, beginning with the take-over of a small neighborhood Mexican restaurant for dinner, then home for singing, dancing and fine collegiality.

Internal: House welcomes the Mark Reames family from Osaka for four days to begin their Christmas vacation in the U.S.A.

Contradiction: Regrounding the total picture in order to quickly and effectively place troops to bring off the new quarter's tactical system. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Final clean-up of San Jose House readies it for sale. Eight buyers want House and good deal is set for December 15.

Internal: Attendance of San Jose women at the Global Womens Forum and interior decision are key events of GWF on peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating the practical forms for missional task of the metro cadre. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Weekend California Planning Meeting is held in Oak Park Church, with all meals and for motels inkinded. The key 11 maneuvers for California focus on Development, HDP preparation and impact.

Internal: Sacramento Metro Cadre decides to hold monthly ecclesiola meetings and weekly GWF and church impact task forces.

Contradiction: Developing a metro cadre manual that holds tension between comprehensive and particular. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Twenty-five attend regional council/New Year's celebration. Twenty five hundred dollars for Almner Village adoption is in hand. House mails 2,500 RS-I brochures to TM grads.

Internal: Discontinuity ends with preparation for regional council and New Year's celebration of the adoption of Almner and the completion of Washington.

Contradiction: Using recreated human power on the other side of celebration and discontinuity to catalyze Quarter III's snowball to roll. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

Internal: Ecclesiola is again a delightful oasis in the week, as guests outnumber House people present and study on consen] us and decision-making heralds the promise of real engagement in society. New clarity on the California Plan releases practical images of local doing. Day of fasting grounds local responsibility for the whole world.

Contradiction: Investing Christmas and New Year's eve celebrations with depth and intrigue. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House and colleagues raise \$630.00 in Development maneuver which goes faster and raises more money than was planned.

Contradiction: Clarifying the necessary strategic and imaginal shifts now that everyone is fully employed. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

Internal: House celebrates Christmas discontinuity and New Year's with Quarter III planned.

Contradiction: Grasping the catalytic tactics that will turn winter dulldrums into a victory carnival. (Wk. 1)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: All the House regathers after eight weeks of GCF maneuvers bringin continental and area council reports. Area council creates an economic task force and plans Quarter III maneuvers.

Internal: Fast day is occasion for Quarter III regional planning leading into tremendous Christmas celebration: tree secured and trimmed by Emering Generation, House decorated and son of Claus appears with gifts for everyone.

Contradiction: Discerning the key strategy that releases the Quarter II gifts of the three campaigns so that all the region might share in them. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: December newsletter is mailed. Visit with UBC contact-breaks Development ice and opens new moves into Anglican Church lay funding. Area Montreal Development maneuver sets up Lorne funding.

Internal: House reports and plans on the other side of the new edges and indicatives of contintntal council.

Contradiction: Organizing internal systems to set the stage for January BritishColumbia maneuver. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

Internal: Victory weekend opens with Christmas decor celebration and breakthrough in self-support with first secured job in wide-open apartment cleaning market and closes with House participation in Posada celebration.

Contradiction: Releasing winning plays in each huddle through instantaneous rehearsals of total game plan. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: \$40,000 working in proposals submitted over last two weeks for Town Meeting: Texas. Five houses meet over Thanksgiving weekend to evaluate the all-yellow condition in Oklahoma and the soon-to-be-all-yellow condition in Texas.

Internal: House inkinds everything we need for western sector meeting.

Contradiction: Building a transrational model for Quarter III that allows for intensive local development. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: New street signs routed and painted, posts up. Board of Aldermen names street in front of school "Joseph W. Mathews Memorial Drive." 150 residents go to Cleveland to see Xerox commercial on giant color screen. Title XX proposal finally clears 100% funding retroactive to Oct. 1st. Congressman David Bowen and Sen John Stennis announce that E.P.A. has awarded Pace a \$7200 grant for sewer system 20l study.

Internal: Thanksgiving dinner in Pace with Pacers and House followed on Friday night with a sector celebration where the Memphis, Pace and New Orleans Houses mixed to create great Town Meeting dramas in Star Wars, Sesame Street, and Charlies' Angels.

Contradiction: Using holiday mindset to raise money for the mission. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Hardeman County looks to a Jan. Twon Meeting

Internal: Memphis House packs up and celebrates community Thanksgiving, a dinner theatre of stars and a workday of miracles in Delta Pace. December planning with New Orleans and Pace spurs new insights to complete the quarter's work.

Contradiction: Using the scheduled TM's and those already held for new hooks into last counties. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Voter Education Project submits proposal to another funding agency to hire the ICA to set up 23 TMs in January through March.

Internal: Small-town USA theme transforms parlor to town square as Atlanta, Miami, Charlotte and colleagues join for a fabulous New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Moving on last quarter's set-up commitments without delaying corporate work on the quarter's planning. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Three TMs are held in far western part of the state with ten more in the chute.

Internal: Youth cluster receives school report cards, then plans to intentionalize study time.

Contradiction: Developing field contacts that can allow TM set-up over the phone. (Wk 8)

External: Nexus sends out special strike forces to Des Moines and Kansas City for the TM campaign and launches the Latin American Beachhead troops into South America. Three are sent to the Langub HDP Consult in the Philippines, as well as two to HDTs in Maliwada. Guardians respond to Maneuver '77 by volunteering time for health acceleration treks to Isle of Dogs (two) and Lagos (five). Panchayat trek is sent to India.

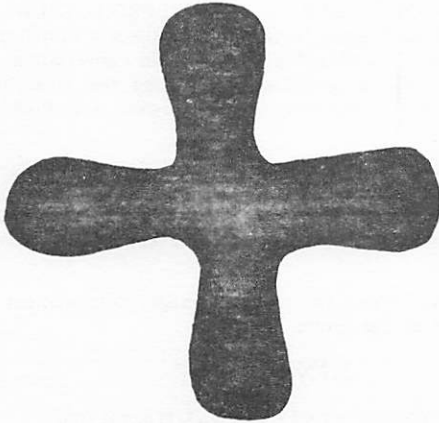

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Development team hits the road. Wales site seeing trip visits over 100 communities. Isle of Dogs Society is launched with seven founder members and 25 total participating members. Health Trek arrives and is joined by three from community project in Glasgow who got connected through permeator job.

Internal: House participates in a wild ecclesiola as names are selected for House rooms from British heroes with a near riot between the English and the Irish over Cromwell.

Contradiction: Winning when just an inch away from three major victories. (Wk 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Maneuvers begin for the Tartan Swirl with colleagues named to allow for effective coverage of the nation.

Internal: Doug Allan joins "The Midas Touch" in London as Huang Hsing Peng, Fiona Willock, Jean Taylor, and David Cunningham join troops in Glasgow.

Contradiction: Allowing the story of "Town Meeting Awakening" to move swiftly through the extensive use of "those who care." (Wk, 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: The astounding impact of 10 TMs (1300 people) in Wales leaves one fifth of the UK counties colored yellow. Speaker of the House, George Thomas decides to assemble 30 MPs from Wales for our report in January. Wales HDP site selection and authorization are underway.

Internal: Interludes are filled with British darts championship, generals club and soccer match (provincials v. Londoners) which doubles in size from 10 to 20 a side as neighborhood youth sympathize and join in.

Contradiction: Building win into HDP launch and completion simultaneously. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Quarter's decision is extension of areal maneuvers and radical troop deployment from TM to development and HDP. Principal quarter target is the Tartan Swirl, spinning 33 TMs in Scotland, The Midas Touch, raising year's development goal of \$100,000 in quarter III and more in store, addressing the principal HDP contradiction with profound economic signs.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration is sheer Dr. Lao with House skits including ICA consultant Ghandiwald's visit to convince 250 Indian Villages to adopt First World City and Emerging Generation presentation at school.

Contradiction: Maintaining movement in development campaigns.(Wk. 2)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: M. Galinou, from the Chamber of Agriculture in the department of La Marne, sets up an account of 8000 francs for villages in the Marne to draw on if they can't afford to pay the entire fee for a Forum Communautaire in their village. A letter arrives from a volunteer who wishes to spend the summer in an HDP.

Internal: House returns from discontinuity having hosted the Cramers and Martha Dempster for their discontinuity in Paris. House celebrates New Year's Eve in the midst of planning for Quarter III. Regional visitors arrive daily to help with planning. Diann Porter returns from Chicago. Visitors include Jajudeen Ogunbiyi and Mark Johnson from Ijeda and Carroll Smith from Town Meeting Wales Campaign.

Contradiction: Using the gift of nationalism. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: The week begins with a Christmas Eve youth dance, a huge bonfire in the Piazza and midnight mass and

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP)
ends with a victorious New Year's Eve dance. Community leadership decides to take on responsibility for the project at midweek Comitato meeting.

Internal: Experience of discontinuity at a time in which even more happens than usual as visitors from Paris and Rome spend time in Termine; House celebrates Christmas with midnight mass followed by a 2 a.m. dinner and prepares to meet a new quarter of victory with three days of planning.

Contradiction: Pushing against the Italian trend of away from villages by deciding to do rural communities (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: A bulldozer and grader arrive to clear industrial site new farm and roads. A chainsaw inkinded to enable clearing. All electrical supplies and a generator is inkinded and delivered for street lighting.

Internal: House participates in Christmas dinner at guardians home with turkey, dressing and four kinds of ice cream.

Contradiction: Wrapping up the details of an abundant December. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Two Nexus meetings are held following Continental Council pushing through implications for Quarter III and revealing requirements for ordinary and for extraordinary responses.

Internal: Liveliness of all meetings turning work into sheer spirit has become the normal during this Advent season.

Contradiction: Completing battleplanning before next quarter amid holiday dispersment. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Area Council puts all on "death ground" re:Town Meeting, Development and GWF, resulting in radical troop assignments and weekly area maneuver weekends. Eight car companies are contacted for car loans for Quarter III and Quarter IV.

Internal: House celebrates the birth on Christmas Day of Saskia Rebecca to Jon and Margaret Wenge.

Contradiction: Keeping on top of the practical requirements of the maneuvers - money, cars and child care without losing sight of each week's victory. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: GWF follow up results in the decision to hold another GWF on February 11 in Frankfurt. Grads from last GWF see responsibility for Indian villages. The Appointment with pastor from Sachseuhausen (Frankfurt) brings forth a new screen for Adopt a Village on ecumenical level. Materials task force gathers quotes, songs and montage for German TM workbook.

Internal: The housekeeper of the Educational Center where the area council is held donates DM1000 (\$450) to Indian villages instead of buying a fur coat as a Christmas gift for herself.

Contradiction: Forming authorization for area maneuver in Ruhr Valley. (Wk. 2)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Community organizes itself to plan for Kreuzberg Ost quarterly planning council. New volunteer waiter in cafe has all the ladies swooning. Area Frankfurt quarterly planning council is held in Augustinian Retreat Center in

West Germany. Developed monies for week include 1,000 DM from retreat center house mother for support of an Indian village project, 1,800 DM from Hamburg church bazaar sponsored by elders and 3,050 DM raised by another church in Hamburg.

Internal: Charles and Doris Hahn arrive for management trek and Charles joins Area Frankfurt for quarterly planning council.

Contradiction: Implementing all project and areal priorities with finesse. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: U.S. ambassador's visit to the Project is firmed up for December 27. Wednesday evening guild conversation is led by ofne of the guilders, symbolizing the emerging decision of the community to take over the Project leadership.

Internal: House children are scared out of their wits as Rich Michael becomes Santa at House Christmas party. Reflection on Development reveals the necessity for a consistent push on Development with people from the community being involved.

Contradiction: Forging the concrete images to implement a broad picture of the future. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS ois on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added toHouse with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

C Contradiction: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers tha assure victory. (WK. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL'BAYAD HDP

Contradiction: Completing the GWF report to begin capturing the momentum established in Quarter II in several arenas in order to build Quarter III maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: Upstate New York field is launched Saturday with meeting in Syracuse, including representatives from Albany, Binghamton and Rochester. (Over half were metro colleagues.) Global Servant Force engaged with Metro Guardian, Judith Lindblad, on full-time assignment to Northern Division Strike Force. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: The North circuit team has 4 out of 5 counties with dates. River Valley in Nipissing county sends 25 of its 150 residents to Forum. All were in trapping, hunting or lumber businesses and three spoke English.

Internal: Reception for Marguerite LePage prior to India assignment allows old colleagues to get together for the first time in three quarters.

Contradiction: Appropriating tradition. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Lorne resident and ICA staff journey to nation's capitol to tell the Lorne de l'Acadie story and to further the financial undergirding of the project. In Lorne the ice-covered roof of the firehall is completed by bare-handed men in -10C weather.

Internal: The wedding of Tom Greyshock and Connie Moore is celebrated with parents coming from opposite sides of the world. Both community and House are impacted with the bridal shower, bachelor's party, followed by the wedding celebrated by Fr. Albert in the parish church.

Contradiction: In the midst of a five-week manouever with many things happening, the style of immediacy and experience of not much happening indicate that the underlying contradiction is inadequate manouevre imagery. (Wk 10)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS-CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Foro Comunitario in Rio Caribe with 189 registered is occasion for great celebration in village and in metro. Cano Negro and two residents out to help enable the Foro. The arrival of the Economic Acceleration Trek helps to launch the week of the "Cano Negro Commercial Garden." Nine Venezuelan Agricultural experts participate in this event and create a 10-page manual on how to grow papaya and squash. Four hectorares of land are prepared for planting. A tree nursery is built in two days by the newly commissioned farm workers, and the week is capped off by a mock wedding between the community and the garden with the newly inked tractor arriving dressed up as a bride and 500 prepared bags of papaya seedlings as the groom. This was followed by a wild fiesta which lasted until the wee hours of the morning.

Internal: House welcomes colleagues from Chicago who challenge intents about effective village economy and celebrates Thanksgiving as part of House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping vehicles out of the garages and on the road. (Wk. 11)

Village Adoption Program is agreed to by a Milwaukee Episcopal Church and Catholic Church in New Orleans. Chicago's Grand 343 gains momentum as Nexus sends 500 Christmas cards at collegium. The contradiction lies in the arena of finishing the year with the 343 in hand.

Global Research Centrum reports a week of intensive planning and reorganization with quarter maneuvers written (such as "Boot Camp," "Going Nova," and "Early Bird" representing Academy, CYF and on-time Ecclesiola and Journal, respectively), a revolution in centrum space arrangement and in post troop configuration into three parts: Pure Research, Practical Designs and Movement Training. The quarter's task was launched with exploration of the Harvard University HDP student intern proposal, scheduling of Community Youth Forums and printing of the spring Academy brochure. As the importance of the research task increases in relation to program profundity and future vision it misses regular global linking of minds crucial in the research task and struggles with appropriate report and exchange systems to construct global band commonness.

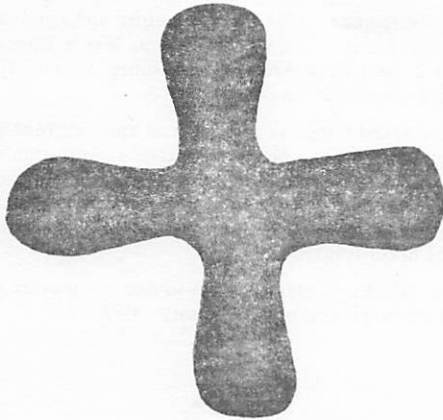

Chicago inkind moves on TM support with 40,000 four-color covers, cars and meals. Production prepares Oxfordized and French versions of Canadian TM workbook. Management personnel are getting into the field for a firsthand look at the particular issues and concerns to be dealt with. The contradiction is the effective means for accounting for what we have said needs to happen.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Development team hits the road. Wales site seeing trip visits over 100 communities. Isle of Dogs Society is launched with seven founder members and 25 total participating members. Health Trek arrives and is joined by three from the community project in Glasgow who got connected through permeator job.

Internal: House participates in a wild ecclesiola as names are selected for House rooms from British heroes with a near riot between the English and the Irish over Cromwell.

Contradiction: Winning when just an inch away from three major victories. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Maneuvers begin for the Tartan Swirl with colleagues named to allow effective coverage of the nation.

Internal: Doug Allen joins "The Midas Touch" in London as Huang Hsing Peng, Fiona Willock, Jean Taylor and David Cunningham join troops in Glasgow.

Contradiction: Allowing the story of "Town Meeting Awakement" to move swiftly through the extensive use of "Those who care." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Follow-up meeting with Barry Youth TM group results in decision to 'do' one of the proposals from their day which was to make a new cement walk down to the beach with the Council approval and support. Visit with Fieldwork Tutor of Swansea University holds out the possibility of one-day training event in the spring for the supervisors in that department.

Internal: Coffman's baby, Katherine Elizabeth, arrives on January 5th 'in the stream' of activity as the Wales Trek team (site selection) passes through long enough for a bowl of soup and picking up sleeping bags and blankets.

Contradiction: Keeping the enthusiasm and much-needed momentum to secure three TMs by end of March in the midst of 'stretched' troops. (Wk. 3)

Internal: House sends out L. Smith to area assignment to Isles of Dogs for quarter as C. Smith returns after carrying Wales report to area councils in Paris and Frankfurt.

Contradiction: Articulating the victory before getting lost in the smoke of the battle. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum Communautaire training day, done in French, trains nine people representing three phases and three nations (France, England and Columbia).

Internal: English language students increase from one to six as a result of ads in neighborhood shops.

Contradiction: Quickly multiplying by ten the number of initial development contacts. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: The week begins with a Christmas Eve youth dance, a huge bonfire in the Piazza and midnight mass and ends with a victorious New Year's Eve dance. Community leadership decides to take on responsibility for the project at midweek Comitato meeting.

Internal: Experience of discontinuity at a time in which even more happens than usual as visitors from Paris and Rome spend time in Termine;

Contradiction: Pushing against the Italian trend of away from villages by deciding to do rural communities. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: A bulldozer and grader arrive to clear industrial site, new farm and roads. A chainsaw inkinded to enable clearing. All electrical supplies and a generator is inkinded and delivered for street lighting.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

Internal: House participates in Christmas dinner at guardians home with turkey, dressing and four kinds of ice cream.

Contradiction: Wrapping up the details of an abundant December. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus facility provides space for Area Brussels training of TM steering committee and workshop leaders, with Nexus troops participating as staff.

Internal: Collegiums and Ecclesiola study of TIME essay, "Challenging the Inevitable" launches quarter of depth reflection.

Contradiction: Setting internal time designs that enable the pace to meet the external demands. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Area Council puts all on "death ground" re: Town Meeting, Development and GWF, resulting in radical troop assignments and weekly area maneuver weekends. Eight car companies are contacted for car loans for Quarter III and Quarter IV.

Internal: House celebrates the birth on Christmas Day of Saskia Rebecca to Jon and Margaret Wenge.

Contradiction: Keeping on top of the practical requirements of the maneuvers - money, cars and child care without losing sight of each week's victory. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: GWF follow up results in the decision to hold another GWF on February 11 in Frankfurt. Grads from last GWF see responsibility for Indian villages. The Appointment with pastor from Sachsehausen (Frankfurt) brings forth a new screen for Adopt a Village on ecumenical level. Materials task force gathers quotes, songs and montage for German TM workbook

Internal: The housekeeper of the Educational Center where the area council is held donates DM1000 (\$450) to Indian villages instead of buying a fur coat as a Christmas gift for herself.

Contradiction: Forming authorization for area maneuver in Ruhr Valley. (Wk. 2)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Community organizes itself to plan for Kreuzberg Ost quarterly planning council. New volunteer waiter in cafe has all the ladies swooning. Area Frankfurt quarterly planning council is held in Augustinian Retreat Center in West Germany. Developed monies for week include 1,000 DM from retreat center house mother for support of an Indian village project, 1,800 DM from Hamburg church bazaar sponsored by elders and 3,050 DM raised by another church in Hamburg.

Internal: Charles and Doris Hahn arrive for management trek and Charles joins Area Frankfurt for quarterly planning council.

Contradiction: Implementing all project and areal priorities with finesse. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: U.S. ambassador's visit to the Project is firmed up for December 27. Wednesday evening guild conversation is led by one of the guilders, symbolizing the emerging decision of the community to take over the Project leadership

Internal: House children are scared out of their wits as Rich

Michael becomes Santa at House Christmas party. Reflection on Development reveals the necessity for a consistent push on Development with people from the community being involved.

Contradiction: Forging the concrete images to implement a broad picture of the future. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS is on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week Area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradiction: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers that assure victory. (WK. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Canadian embassy provides funding for fish farm. Public electric lighting is turned on. Architecture students of Ain Sharns University are assigned to design Bayad Plaza as a class project. Bishop Samuel of Coptic Orthodox Church proclaims victory in a visit to Bayad by saying, "I now see that real 'human' development is going on here."

Internal: Village family (Tanyas Farag Saad) request internship in House.

Contradiction: Forming the local management systems and structures to ensure the victory of having development in village hands. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Five Village Meetings are held during discontinuity. Front running village for new project passes all tests to date with fantastic Village Meeting, authorization and receptivity. Four out of five Village Meetings add new yellow to Kenya map; Director General of Muslim Council wants VM in every Muslim village in Kenya and they will pay. Unexpected K.Shs. 21 000 arrives in mail.

Internal: First trainee to be sponsored by Muslim Council arrives at project with suitcase in hand.

Contradiction: Taking anxieties about imminent shifts as motivation rather than paralysis. (Wk. 2).

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: Press reporters visit at instigation of State Bank of India. Guardian hosts tw. demonstration visits. Largest Continental Council held with a total of 314 assigned to Nava Gram Prayas as HDTs graduates 114 students-largest yet. Preschool Training Module begins in Maliwada for 10 days.

Internal: Health Acceleration Team sent out to Vaviharsh Health Training Module.

Contradiction: Aligning auxiliary and village in preparing for Quarter III battleplanning. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: City Bank runs quarter page advertisement highlighting Maliwada project in major India papers. Tata's Taj Mahal Hotel made the first installment on Chikhale sponsorship. House meets the vice-president of the Century Rayons who shows keen interest in sponsoring a village.

Internal: Christmas Eve was celebrated with which treats thirty-one souls to the finest Keralili feast, exchange of gifts, carol singing and the arrival of Hemalatha J and Kavitha from Calcutta.

Contradiction: Establishing the interior modes for Ashram Operations which will enable devising the service structures to meet the needs of the explosion of Nava Gram Prayas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH VAVIHARSH HDP

External: In village shramdam, preschool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwali, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to two factions in the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in yach of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up and welcomes three new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad, and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians Meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: GWF with 26 elite women gives new authorization base

Internal: Swirl of guest for GWF and development happens. Marie Paul goes to Chandigarh to enable Dethé family after the death of Monni's sister, Rohini.

Contradiction: Refocusing energy after GWF breakthrough. (Wk. 11)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP**

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: First trip of the year is to Jamshedpur, center of Tata, one of the biggest engineering complexes in India. Inkind travel for the trip augers well for village project support in eastern India. Participants leave for the new Training School in Maliwada, 36 hours train journey away.

Internal: New station and commission assignments take effect and give concrete form to the new year as job-hunting continues.

Contradiction: Ensuring each activity is effectively related to the comprehensive and the necessary deed, using maneuver and other movemental screens. (Wk. 2).

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Area Singapore sends three to CTC in Sydney, Nugroho family to Australia for one-year assignment, and Augusta and Titus Jayasekras to HDTS in Korea. GCF task force gets moving on completing brochure and workbook for Town Meeting in Indonesian and Malay.

Internal: Nexus begins New Year with quarterly planning and celebrates end of 1977 with an Open House as Wayside Inn dynamic continues with up to 30 people in residence.

Contradiction: Getting work and planning done quick enough to get the job done. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGGAI AUP HDP

External: GCF task force does back-up and planning for major campaign in S.E. Asia. Sarawak State Development Officer submits HDP proposal to Deputy State Secretary.

Internal: Quarterly battleplanning is completed as Sungai Aup House meets together for first time since September.

Contradiction: Moving with precision while clouded by ambiguity about future location and field of engagement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Many and varied activities keep people of the village and the auxiliary busy as they clean irrigation ditches to padi field, hold Imaginal Education Course in Port Dixon for the Tadika teachers, divert river to prepare for the dam building. Women of the village engage in the first industry, gloves. A new English teacher is recruited, demonstration garden is started and the game of badminton flourishes as the youth sports program gets underway

Internal: House welcomes three sojourners, sends three staff out to teach Indicative Process Methods to women's division of the Malaysia Trades Union Congress in Malacca, and sends Michael Gordon-Smith back to Australia and the Economic Intensification Trek on to Indonesia.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum after Eco-trek as different colleagues move in and out of the village. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: With economic intensification team here, four new industries begin--chickens, rabbits, children's clothing and a community store. Baby Contest brings out 50 mothers and 50 babies. Entire staff travels to Singapore for Area Council--50 in total from entire area.

Internal: Discontinuity, evaluation and planning give shape to week.

Contradiction: Using and effectively training staff who remain in Kelapa Dua. (Wk. 2).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House deepens relationship with local colleagues as we visit homes during holidays and host on New Year's Eve. Area Council in Singapore reinforces our global vision as we struggle with area needs and form a consensus, taking into consideration the three nation situations.

Internal: Discontinuity and Christmas after Area Council, refreshes and renews troops for the development of the face of the mission in Sumatra relative to expansion and awakening.

Contradiction. Making the leap to do quarter planning rather than waiting. (Wk. 2)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development treks visit Seoul and Toyko. Acceleration trek begins in Nam Wai. Davao Consult of Langub begins with more than 40 Guardians from the Philippines. One ton of in-kind paper is shipped free to Manila for Davao Consult document.

Internal: House hosts Jane Miller on her way back to Seoul and Maureen Jenkins on her way to Davao.

Contradiction: Getting on the other side of immediacy so as to work out of the entire picture. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Travel funds are raised and tour sent out to the Korean HDTS, including Wong Ching-On of the auxiliary staff. Economic Acceleration Trek arrives and triggers new mushroom and electronics industries. Village landowners agree to sell land to village for economic ventures. Villagers complete football pitch field and celebrate with a rousing game of soccer. Elders decide to financially support the preschool.

Internal: Auxiliary takes first hot shower in eight months in newly built shower cubicle.

External: Hai Ou duck farm begins. Preschool amazes village at New Year's Eve celebration with its singing and dancing. Time line is completed for the quarter to pull off the new economic development of Hai Ou.

Internal: Christmas and New Year celebrations are intensified with the presence of the acceleration trek. Christmas carolling in the village and delicious Christmas feast with villagers is the highlight.

Contradiction: Reorganizing troops and time to meet intensified demand of the task with troops disbursed all over the area. (Wk. 2).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Ten consultants from Manila corporations go to Langub HDP

Internal: Entire House is impacted by style of generalship exhibited in film "MacArthur."

Contradiction: Separating anxiety issues from life and death issues. (Wk. 2).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Colleagues organize ten weeks of pedagogy in preparation for RS-I course.

Internal: Ecclesiola explodes as 30 people celebrate the 72nd birthday of Peter Hu and send him to Human Development Training School in Korea to represent China.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to tell old and new friends "what is ICA." (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Regional Director of Health and Culture agrees to train four villagers in electricity technology to prepare them to run the "Sudtonggan Electric Company." Shrimp traps in first week of successful operation catch two kilos a day which sell for up to 30 pesos a kilo. Second Buri factory in first week of operation brings total employed in Buri to 70 now.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP)

Internal: Morning study of Philippine national hero, Jose Rizal, informs long-range vision of Philippine local man.

Contradiction: Creating new team effectivity out of Lone Rangers, shifting from 007 to Starwars Crew. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Coca-Cola donates entrance sign to Langub Human Development Project. Pillars go up on Langub Barangay Hill during community work week in preparation for Consult with 100 local people participating. Community meeting registers 25 full-time consultants with more possibilities still to come. Community plans enablement and assignments for Consult week. General Ahorro of the Philippine Constabulary gives military authorization for the LHDP.

Internal: Four attend baptismal celebration for granddaughter of Francisco Dizon, a major donor - a major social event in the city where many people who have not been in their offices at this time of year are found.

Contradiction: Nailing down the commitments to secure consultants in the necessary Consult arenas. (Wk. 2)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: First Tokyo ICA volunteers meeting is a great help in understanding Japanese government structures and agencies. Key Tokyo Guardians meet to plan upcoming Guardians breakfast. Warner Lambert donates 120,000 yen (U.S. \$500).

Internal: Joseph Kim, 16-year-old Korean sojourner, is sent out to Jeju Human Development Training School.

Contradiction: Strategically planning the events that will intrigue and engage the Japanese colleagues and Guardians who are emerging out of the woodwork. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Six hundred heads of lettuce are planted in vinyl house as demonstration. The preparation of the HDTS is being kicked toward the goal as massive amounts of decor are constructed.

Internal: House is crowded with colleagues and guests who come for the preparation of HDTS.

Contradiction: Creating the practical and objective vision which will clarify and make possible a common plan. (Wk.2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House translates nine modules for HDTS, recruits participants, sends three faculty to Jeju, intensifies grassroots funding campaign, and receives \$26 bag of inkind sugar for the school.

Internal: Whole House takes two days to build Quarter III maneuvers.

Contradiction: Funding HDTS, a Consult and a new HDP in one month. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The House disperses its energies in looking for site of second Japan HDP. Regular guildier, Mr. Cho, helps in making report to Guild on return. Guild begins new year—a year older and ready to do Chikii Kan Dankai visitation (Town Meeting).

Internal: House celebrates two birthdays of over-30 adults.

Contradiction: Focusing time and attention on external mission while troops are assigned elsewhere. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Tinder carefully laid by Guardian's spin bursts into flame with the discovery that the key maneuver of the quarter is a Community Forum starburst in the Kii (key) Peninsula.

Internal: File refinement turns up old contacts who become part of new quarter's plans.

Contradiction: Recovering momentum fast enough for the many events which are just ahead. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Sapporo cross country ski course is visited while exploration for local ski course is expanded. Physical survey forms are distributed for daily stake walk checks. Stake maps and decor are prepared for stake meetings. Battleplan is built for Early Learning Center, with opening scheduled in January, 1978. On Wk II, 40 towns are visited by five circuit teams to break open TM in Hokkaido.

Internal: New assignment formate into guild arenas maximizes program expansion. Thanksgiving party with local residents introduces new customs. Three new jobs are obtained for self-support.

Contradiction: Pushing through Project programs and area maneuvers with troops on hand. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

Contradiction Using past groundwork to realize breaklooses in new arenas. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Caltex makes unsolicited donation. Regional colleague goes to CTC as faculty. Iron colleague says yes to GWF core and Committee of 100.

Internal: Tribal resettlement becomes necessary event as House members become attached to rooms.

Contradiction: Risking ourselves in discovering new gemstones, or being constantly about expanding our territory. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

Internal: School breaks for long summer holidays.

Contradiction: Maintaining a vision beyond immediate irritations and annoyances. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Another building project is completed as Oombulgurri now has a jetty to unload small freight and passengers. More of the community show up to work than on any other project.

Internal: House sends out primary school teacher, Margaret Halloran after year of joyous abandon to OHDP.

Contradiction: Naming and preparing the cast that will be up front on the Completion Celebration Day. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Research on Walkabout reveals five aboriginal Community Meetings to be held in S.A. in February.

Internal: Phase I summer program (Marching into the Future) hits Adelaide, swelling the House size from six to 33 in two days.

Contradiction: Utilizing the gift of Australian society's discontinuous January to create the comprehensive plan for the year. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Guardian slide night with Oombulgorri task force recruits team for the January task force. Richard Evans comes through on return to Oombulgorri.

Internal: Kim Thornton shares edge brooding on practical forms of the Global Servant Force.

Contradiction: Designing practical aspects of maneuver and internal life structures for month of January. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Area Sydney summer program begins in Sydney with a bang with 45 around the table. Final invitations are sent for Oombulgorri completion.

Internal: Nexus sends out Banks to finalize development planning and then on to aboriginal site selection and state government authorization. Cocks go to summer program, Thornton to Melbourne on development and youth and Emerging Generation to Adelaide for camp.

Contradiction: Moving on federal authorization for new projects and GWF with one person left who works out. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Advertisement in newspaper for teacher for Oombulgorri yields urban aborigine who says yes to CTC prior to joining Walkabout team. Local Catholic Church comes up with scholarship to help pay CTC fees. Seventy-five pounds of seed and bookshelves are inked and air freighted free to Oombulgorri.

Internal: House celebrates New Year's by spending the week battleplanning programs for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Finding a way to get a committed "yes" from the resources at our disposal. (Wk. 2)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Launching of the Showplace results in 198 signing up for guilds. Fourteen stores publish ad for lowest prices on staple foods. Preschool doubles in size with beginning of the mobile preschool.

Internal: New intentionality in House Emerging Generation structures impacts community children, as our Emerging Generation recreate their image as "demonstration Iron Man" in the Showplace.

Contradiction: Transforming the yes into a deep resolve. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: L. Kamu, ITI grad and Methodist Church experimental plantation director, gives vital information on village leadership and decision-making system to get permission for GCF and development strategy. Western Samoa Minister of Public Works gives support to project with "any kind of help needed." Public official pays for rock gathering permit as contribution to beautification project and radio station gives free ads.

Internal: Bamboo sprout Christmas tree "grows" in collegium room as Quarter III battleplanning offers exciting look at future possibilities.

Contradiction: Moving it through Christmas discontinuity. (Wk. 2)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: House organizes into four patrols: Area, State, Regional and Systems and sends John Montgomery of the Area Patrol to Oregon to begin the Great Northern March for Town Meeting Oregon.

Internal: First Ecclesiola of the year is a high event as the Emerging Generation enthusiasm and decor materials brings off the Star Wars decor theme.

Contradiction: Forging a comprehensive timeline using tactical system and all that's known about this quarter. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Final clean-up of San Jose House readies it for sale. Eight buyers want House and good deal is set for December 15.

Internal: Attendance of San Jose women at the Global Womens Forum and interior decision are key events of GWF on peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating the practical forms for missional task of the metro cadre. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Weekend California Planning Meeting is held in Oak Park Church, with all meals and four motels inked. The key 11 maneuvers for California focus on Development, HDP preparation and impact.

Internal: Sacramento Metro Cadre decides to hold monthly ecclesiola meetings and weekly GWF and church impact task forces.

Contradiction: Developing a metro cadre manual that holds tension between comprehensive and particular. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Area's Northern Division Team gathers, does initial planning for Oregon TM campaign, moves to Oregon base, is greeted with open arms by Oregon City TM grads and gets 12 names for authorization committee in the first 24 hours in Oregon.

Internal: New Religious House is found and secured.

Contradiction: Getting organized so the few troops can do it all at once. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Key woman from the November Santa Margarita Town Meeting which had a volatile start calls to say, "This town hasn't been the same since the Town Meeting." She reports actuated proposals and a new spirit of involvement and requests another TM for February to launch the renewed Civic Association. "I'm going to contact everyone in town to see that they get involved in the decision-making," she declares, and proceeds to lay out her detailed plan for doing so.

Internal: A fortune teller in the oasis and a wailing wall launched the Los Angeles New Year's Eve celebration. To the enchanting sound of bells during a Moroccan feast, moonlight filtered through the palace roof and revealed the gracious sensuous rhythm of a belly dancer enticing all the men to donate their fortunes. At the dawning moment a phone call to Bombay symbolizes global unity.

Contradiction: Unblocking the newly created task forces to work on the quarter's missional arenas in the evenings. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: New Mexico TM campaign secures inkind printing of state brochure and a letter from the Governor to put in it. ICA is asked to train ASU professors responsible for continuing education in community dynamics.

Internal: House finishes quarter battleplan with ten big miracles set out.

Contradiction: Creating the clear symbolic models to show how regional forces will pull off mission. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Evening with the Institute impacts GWF grads and GWF grad prepares to go on TM circuit. TMs set and held begin to turn Utah gold.

Internal: House circuiters and metro experience celebration and thanksgiving through a great Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Allowing stories of revolution to broaden the context and engage troops. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Carl and Margaret Ennis are sent to do the Oregon Campaign. A visitor from TM who drops in and wants to know about leading a follow-up workshop gives hope and promise of an HDP in Montana.

Internal: Carl and Margaret Ennis, Duane Dirickson, Lisa Newkirk, Ross Wiltse and Vera and Sandy Ariel are all sent out to new locations and new assignments.

Contradiction: Figuring out our external task in the midst of all our internal tasks. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Three of the remaining ten counties are set up in three days. RS-1 recruiting calls gain momentum as GCF learnings are applied to winning RS-1 maneuver.

Internal: Twenty-four at House Church and 17 at Ecclesiola begin new quarter with engaging metro.

Contradiction: Putting together story and maneuver tactics for several arenas so that each will win the three campaigns. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Town Meeting steering committee and date are formalized for Bismark TM. Day Care staff shows dynamics of real local leadership by deciding to assume responsibility for the whole program—self-support, curriculum and public relations. Two area development troops and the auxiliary spend three days on a Development PSU to allow house to authentically engage in Development.

Internal: House is entertained and enlightened with Ray Richmond's spins on Oombulgurri, especially the local economic story complete with illustration.

Contradiction: Putting tactical concretion on necessary actions and proposals for the quarter while catalyzing local troops to pick up the local engagement. (Wk. 3)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Visits to political structures and inquiries from GWF grads explode new possibilities for authorization and funding.

Contradiction: Grasping the gift that awakening does awaken and engagement demands models. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Models are created and preparations made for British Columbia CFC maneuvers, including revision of the BC brochure.

Internal: House sends out Heather to Minneapolis to join three other Area Edmonton troops for Area self-support task force.

Contradiction: Completing the victory of areal self-support and CFC maneuvers. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: A week of Town Meeting golding, Global Women's Forum breakloose and metro formation includes Aleutians golden through TM in Cold Bay; Chugiak district enroute to golding with two TMs set to happen in the next two weeks; GWFs in Anchorage and Fairbanks coming on strong, with good contacts made and news article in process; Fairbanks metro coordinator is secured under the heading of Fairbanks ICA Coordinator and a good contact for a TM on Barter Island off Alaska's north Arctic coast is made.

Internal: In the wake of visit by area prior Duffy and metro colleague, crabmeat/Australian grog fest is held.

Contradiction: Keeping coordination and logistics functioning to keep all troops moving to advantage while caring for new colleagues and communities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Colleague visitations illuminate readiness of old Movement grads to engage in three campaigns.

Internal: House celebrates the new year with colleagues joining in new circuit game based on Monopoly.

Contradiction: Allowing colleagues to experience the formation of the new Movement and see others engaged in the common task over distance. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Three community young adults go with auxiliary for inkind victories of 110 sheets of gyprock and insulation for community hall and children's center, commitment for equipment for first organized hockey team, and completing licensing procedures for Vogar Products. Winnipeg Cadre core holds organizational meeting.

Internal: Bastion and auxiliary review Canada Victory maneuver plans, tour village, and move into a week of development.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the practical steps to maintain the trend toward creative visible signs. (Wk. 3)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE HOUSTON

External: Inkind donations prepare us for 160 Town Meetings in Texas before Easter Exxon and Shell Oil each agree to print 10,000 Town Meeting workbooks. Two bindery companies donate services. Colleague gives us \$100 worth of office supplies. Paper companies donate paper, Olivetti loans typewriter and masking tape and end rolls roll in.

Internal: House reorganizes its space, writes a Texas song and sends circuiters to the Lone Star Stampede.

Contradiction: Tightening the Town Meeting set-up to insure a yes in every town. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Troops are stationed in Lubbock for Lone Star Stampede with Welch TM held during kick-off events.

Internal: Home front troops fortify self-support with Ca. hv Marsh obtaining full-time job and solidify spirit structures with initiation of Ecclesiola and the reshaping of space with stairwell decor.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO)

External: Sustaining effective flexibility to strike on home front or on maneuver without "doing nothing" in between. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: House completes set-up phase for southern front of Lone Star Stampede, holds first Week II meeting of forces and sends out circuit teams.

Internal: A command post is created with furniture, decor and office system.

Contradiction: Focusing enough troops on circuiting only. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Woodward Town Meeting turns Oklahoma all yellow. Twenty Town Meetings set up in two months reveals that in any setting a Town Meeting can happen with splendid participation.

Internal: Quarterly battleplanning symbolizes decision to win.

Contradiction: Renewing the Religious House dynamic with colleagues. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Set up for Lone Star Stampede continues with one page brochure completed and teams sent to San Antonio and Lubbock from sector meeting in Dallas. Original director of Goals for Dallas, Dr. Bryant Godbold, visits House for very successful discussion of Town Meeting program in Texas.

Internal: Emerging Generation presents Saturday night play "Kawangware: Place of Glory" with champagne and chocolate chip cookies.

Contradiction: Intensifying effectiveness on two fronts of Lone Star Stampede which are both over five hours away. (Wk 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA -DELTA PACE HDP

External: The Delta Pace Community Association elects seven members (four black, three white) of the Board of Directors and begins proceedings for tax-exemption. The 99-page water system study is completed. Leadership Methods Weekend for 16 is held. First check from Title XX grant for \$6900 pays October salaries for preschool.

Internal: First weekly collegium on the Order Polity Document excites all and heightens anticipation for the remainder of the quarter. Seven in House journey to Tuskegee, Ala. for 2½ days of VISTA training and return home to find the first VISTA stipends have come in the mail.

Contradiction: Breaking wide open the economic arena. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: First Gulf Coast TM held in Saucier brings in 200 participants and the news media, giving complete coverage of the day. LA second Church Rally was held Sat. at St. Bernard United Methodist Church using TM methodology, exciting the congregation about their coming year.

Internal: Thanksgiving dinner in Pace with Pacers and House followed on Friday night with a sector celebration where the Memphis, Pace and New Orleans Houses mixed to create great Town Meeting dramas in Star Wars, Sesame Street, and Charlie's Angels.

Contradiction: Using holiday mindset to raise money for the mission. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Two Town Meetings are set-up by phone. Reactivating old networks such as the Jaycees proves easy to work through in West Tennessee as Memphis Jaycee president gives endorsement and contacts for West Tennessee TMs.

Internal: Fast day is broken by midnight feast of goose. Youth early morning wake-up brings freshness to the day.

Contradiction: Facing the tension between collecting old TM IOUs and launching new methods of quick TM set-up which will turn West Tennessee yellow in two weeks. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Voter Education Project submits proposal to another funding agency to hire the ICA to set up 23 TMs in January through March.

Internal: Small-town USA theme transforms parlor to town square as Atlanta, Miami, Charlotte and colleagues join for a fabulous New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Moving on last quarter's set-up commitments without delaying corporate work on the quarter's planning. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Three TMs are held in far western part of the state with ten more in the chute.

Internal: Youth cluster receives school report cards, then plans to intentionalize study time.

Contradiction: Developing field contacts that can allow TM set-up over the phone. (Wk 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Two more TM dates are set. Funding proposals are submitted to two local companies. Session with Youth Project Foundation offers possible consultant relationship.

Internal: An unforgettable evening with the Lee Emericks of Vero Beach raises visions of more such gatherings with parents and relatives of Order families living in Florida.

Contradiction: Matching funding and self-support to Town Meetings. (Wk. 2)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Forays into new territory are launched as the Latin American taskforce is sent out to several locations for site selection, Development, authorization, and HDTs recruitment. Troops from all Centrums are deployed on GWF and social and economic acceleration treks and Development and TM circuits.

Internal: At home, the remnant reconfigures space, troops and time while brooding further at collegiums and within the Centrums about the role of Chicago Nexus in supporting the front-line maneuvers.

Contradiction: Maintaining Chicago Nexus as a global show-piece while focusing resources on bringing off the global task. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Fifth Citizens plan and debrief all programs. Council is conducted with key representatives from banks and the City of Chicago.

Internal: The Ecclesiola is a great event for work and for reflection.

Contradiction: Developing necessary leadership roles to deal with specific arenas without reducing vocation to a specific job description. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Colleague engagement enables TM campaign as four Wichita colleagues fold thousands of brochures for the schools and bankers. Charts are prepared in Salina outpost, one-day circuiters join the set-up and four orchestrators are trained.

Internal: Whole House, wherever they are, uses the journal for dinner reflection.

Contradiction: Determining the optimum set-up models for Kansas awakening. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: One team visits six towns and sets up seven counties for over 100% success ratio. One new orchestrator is trained in 3½ hour model. First two TMs of quarter are held.

Internal: Sojourn week accomplishes quarter battleplan and breakthrough in struggle to create new rhythm for circuiting and in-House dynamic while Susan McCabe is sent out to participate in "Missouri Waltz."

Contradiction: Holding Religious House dynamic with our troops scattered in geography and time. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Forty TMs via phone and mail are set for Weeks 1 and 2.

Internal: New Year's Eve becomes joyous celebration with all phases represented for toasts to the launching of Latin American Beachheads, the reading of the play "Gideon" and entertainment by a ventriloquist.

Contradiction: Getting a plan in front of all before charging down the road at 60 m.p.h. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Eight regional colleagues and House staff are sent to India, Nam Wai and Pacific Islands. LENS is marketed to International Dairy Queen. LENS is set up and scheduled for Department of Natural Resources and new Ulm Chamber of Commerce.

Internal: Four adults and two Emerging Generation from Area Edmonton arrive to join Minneapolis House while earning money for the Canadian Houses.

Contradiction: Deciding what the winds are and what are the needed engines to use in the midst of a smorgasborg of opportunities. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Two TMs are held in S. Illinois, bringing recent total of House to twelve. Conditions of the town and seriousness of the local leaders about rebuilding in Ewing, Ill., indicate the need for GSD. Pocahontas set for next week. Mailing for Open House sent this week.

Internal: House inkind 34 gallons of paint and two meals for 40 which thirteen people devour ravenously during a fantastic workday of scraping, plastering, and painting with help from friends, the Student House.

Contradiction: Scheduling events to cover all the ground all the time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA½

External: Three evening and one all-day TMs are held in new counties. House completes draft of budget for funding blitz. Fifth issue of the Town Meeting: Iowa Update is sent to press.

Internal: First mobile House Church in Cedar Rapids is held with two families and Dick Mark present. Plans for a half-day neighborhood Town Meeting in Cedar Rapids in January as possible first step toward county saturation plan are discussed.

Contradiction: Involving many friendly colleagues in funding blitz so that goal of \$18,000 can be reached. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Town Meeting held on two consecutive days in high school on Menominee Indian Reservation elicits invitation to come back and train the teachers to do one in every classroom.

Internal: Green Bay House moves in with Ken and Barbara Keller family in Appleton parsonage. Colleagues from Oshkosh, Appleton, Wausau and Green Bay join in to make the move in one day.

Contradiction: Enabling our colleagues to see the move as a great gift. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: House sets up five Wisconsin TMs in Iowa and 50 colleagues and companies are visited and follow-up letters are written in midst of Development blitz.

Internal: The St. Johns arrive in time to participate to the hilt in the Wisconsin Launch of the Seven Days of Commitment and a special celebration at our favorite neighborhood restaurant- Mamas (Serbian food). Rick Luedka gives slide presentation on Cano Negro and Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Turning metro leadership possibilities into priorship. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: All three campaigns move with power. TM: Indiana receives its most significant boost to date with five TMs held in five county seats on five consecutive nights with average attendance of 43, despite heavy snow. Fifth City videotape deeply impacts local neighborhood association, catalyzing decision to take a busload of residents for visit in March. Cadre meetings in Lafayette, Louisville, and Indianapolis continue missional strategizing. House Church provides sustenance for 25.

Internal: "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" turns fascination loose during Saturday night celebration and creates real discontinuity.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on the next 23 targeted counties in Central Indiana. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Bo Mohl waltzes to Missouri as Kentucky war-room is readied.

Internal: Open House celebrates arrival of the Haithcocks.

Contradiction: Holding saturation antsiness in check while getting to the starting gate of the Kentucky Derby. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Detroit metro cadre meets for New Year planning and celebration and decides to do 26 TMs in Detroit to care for the city.

Internal: House prepares up-dated mailing list including this quarter's TM participants for the purpose of mailing newsletter, "Michigan Forum."

Contradiction: Reorganizing the resources and the region to do the same amount of work with House troops cut in half. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Initial work on battleplan for Kentucky counties and Quarter III result in exciting plan for all fronts.

Internal: House life battleplanning to care for urban missions and support systems for Quarter III happens.

Contradiction: Expanding forces in midst of battlefront coverage. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: House launches circuits in Nassau County for county intensification with 21 colleagues visited and 12 communities targeted.

Internal: Excellent collegiums: "Maneuvers," "Global Women's Forum" and "Appropriate Symbols" are key to being on the edge of the mission.

Contradiction: Naming and securing tangible victories which allow urgency of engagement to be seen. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Permeator circuits for four days. Former metro colleague calls to say he heard about TM and he'd like to do something again - and could he come for Ecclesiola?

Internal: In the midst of "weather watch" circuiter stops overnight for warm bed and meals, just in time to help when the ceiling falls in due to third story frozen and burst water pipes.

Contradiction: Discovering how small local tasks are crucial part of the global mission. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Nelson Stover and Jan Ulangca participate in site selection of Social Demonstration site possibilities in New York.

Internal: Great Thanksgiving feast with whole of Rochester House present for the first time.

Contradiction: Internalizing methods in order to deal with the flexibility of TM time design. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Maneuver planning for the Washington field which covers VA, MD, DW, and DC scheduled for Week II focuses on county completion, Ivy City Sign and metro circuits.

Internal: House tackles the corporate space with new decor and room designs to care for revolutionary context and prepare to host field maneuver planning weekend.

Contradiction: Deciding the external focus of engagement for the field in addition to logistics prep for the area maneuvers six weeks from now.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: The death of one of the young adults in Ivy City during the Christmas holidays is lifted up in a community memorial service. External: Town Meetings in Pennsylvania begin with two operations: Heritage Trail and Endless Mountains, netting three TM dates in first half day on circuit.

Internal: House becomes logistics center for Town Meetings in Pennsylvania, pulling together models for decor and field maneuver.

Contradiction: Getting momentum going in all arenas. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Field maneuver planning readies metro and House for Week II turf blitz. Servant force hits the phone, making calls for appointments for Week II set-up of TMs for township amplification of Monmouth County, NJ.

Internal: A week of 'pushing the edge' collegiums and conversations on "Appropriate Symbols of the Order," "Maneuvering," "Activating Day II Field Maneuvers," "Global Women's Forum" and a corporate exercise on the exemplars enables clarity.

Contradiction: Naming and securing tangible victories which allow the urgency of engagement to be seen. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: New York field maneuver is set in motion as the NY Battalion jounries through ice storm to spend Saturday in Nassau County netting two possible TMs. Debriefing reveals readiness of Day II troops to pick up intensified struggle of building and enacting maneuvers.

Internal: Maneuver collegium (a la Jim Troxel) grounds the cruciality of the General's task while Ecclesiola study of "The Hero With a Thousand Faces" grounds us again in the cruciality of symbol and story creation through the hero-deed.

Contradiction: Naming and securing tangible victories which allow the urgency of engagement to be seen. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: House makes visits to select county for township saturation and mails letters to colleagues requesting their participation in the saturation maneuver.

Internal: A meeting of personnel from the New England field and the Northern Area Strike Force results in the selection of Rutland County, Vermont for township saturation.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the tasks while finding that the most critical ones are located the greatest distance from the House. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: Upstate New York field is launched Saturday with meeting in Syracuse, including representatives from Albany, Binghamton and Rochester. (Over half were metro colleagues.) Global Servant Force engaged with Metro Guardian, Judith Lindblad, on full-time assignment to Northern Division Strike Force. University student and suburban housewife assume responsibility for development.

Internal: House becomes center of operations for Northern Division strike force who work out development and phasing plan for quarter.

Contradiction: Creating a rational structural design which enables colleague engagement for Week II. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: First metro circuit travels through heavy snowstorm to appointments in Maine and returns to Boston at midnight to find a \$1,000 check in the mail from former Maine legislator. Task forces progress on all fronts as GWF has targeted dates in March and script is completed for Village Adoption slide presentation.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON)

Internal: Revolutionary grocery shopping model is implemented and hallway bulletin board is re-decorated.

Contradiction: Holding the revolutionary edge in task force planning. (Wk. 3)

Internal: House welcomes colleagues from Chicago who challenge intents about effective village economy and celebrates Thanksgiving as part of House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping vehicles out of the garages and on the road. (Wk. 11)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Review of the past quarter reveals engagement in two major GCF maneuvers: New Day New Brunswick and Leeds/Grenville Community Development Days and Northern Ontario and the Quebec counties.

Internal: Quarter is highlighted by two deaths and two marriages. House struggles to discern the appropriate meal-time conversations.

Contradiction: Controlling the sense of frantic-ness in light of an incomplete mission and Christmas discontinuity. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of House is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: House initiates regular Week II trek to Montreal and prepares circuit materials for Quebec campaign.

Internal: Three hundred million years after the snout, we grasp the decision to do "Rendez-vous Quebec" as life and death creativity in the context of a time of dizzying contrast and change.

Contradiction: Scoring with every shot while engaging colleagues in the unknown. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX- LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community involvement is intensified and broadened as the Health Trek trains ten new community health visitors at the same time that 30 community leaders participate in candlelight dinners and commit themselves to detailed planning of the next eight months of the project.

Internal: Auxiliary returns from Christmas discontinuity to participate in a Week II workshop which structures internal life issues, thereby freeing more time for project issues.

Contradiction: Projecting adequate images of leadership transition as project programmes move from ICA-initiated events to community-initiated events. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS-CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Foro Comunitario in Rio Caribe with 189 registered is occasion for great celebration in village and in metro. Cano Negro and two residents out to help enable the Foro. The arrival of the Economic Acceleration Trek helps to launch the week of the "Cano Negro Commercial Garden". Nine Venezuelan Agricultural experts participate in this event and create a 10-page manual on how to grow papaya and squash. Four hectorares of land are prepared for planting. A tree nursery is built in two days by the newly commissioned farm workers, and the week is capped off by a mock wedding between the community and the garden with the newly inked tractor arriving dressed up as a bride and 500 prepared bags of papaya seedlings as the groom. This was followed by a wild fiesta which lasted until the wee hours of the morning.

The contradiction lies in the arena of finishing the year with the 343 in hand.

Global Research Centrum reports a week of actualizing operations with the first in a series of cross-centrum PSU's on the CYF, concentrating on naming the arenas which need refinement. The weekend is highlighted by meal conversations on the youth revolution, initiating Week II conversations on each of the seven revolutions. The constructs will be mailed to Religious Houses on a weekly basis. The key contradiction has to do with unblocking the new vision of the task by dealing with the depth question of, or using methodological tools to rearticulate what the world needs.

Global Operations Centrum reports all three Campaigns moving ahead with GSD site selection in Australia and Latin America, the launching of the Langub HDP in the Philippines—first of the 28 GSD Expansion, Economic Acceleration Trek in Hai Ou and Social Acceleration Trek in the Isle of Dogs. GCF is globalized with first Netherlands TM and 13 scheduled for Belgium and the GCF materials are prepared in Malay and Indonesian languages. GWF is set up and held on several continents simultaneously. Area Sydney opens its summer program with 45 around the table. Area councils in Europe. GCF circuiting in North America and GSD Consult and acceleration events across the globe mobilize and equip the Global Servant Force for its engaging temporal and historical role. The breakloose is happening in the flexible use of troops, both special and regular, in relationship to critical maneuvers. The contradiction has to do with reclarifying campaign strategies in light of the next concrete action required to accomplish the year's priorities.

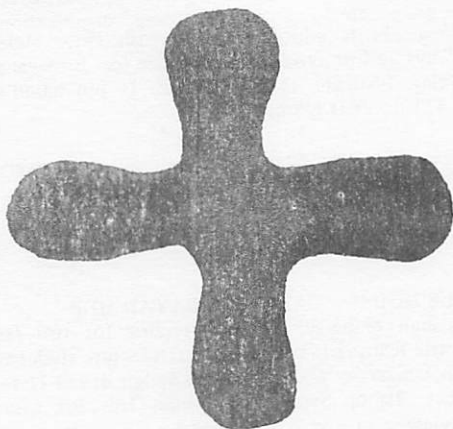

Internal: House is impacted by four Scottish community workers plus the Laxdals, Ken Gilbert, Woody Ahenn, Cynthia Eisenhower and others who form Health Trek; as a result of health collegiums, London fog is renamed legume soup fog.

Contradiction: Conveying urgency to structures to release victories. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Maneuvers begin for the Tartan Swirl with colleagues named to allow effective coverage of the nation.

Internal: Doug Allen joins "The Midas Touch" in London as Huang Hsing Peng, Fiona Willock, Jean Taylor and David Cunningham join troops in Glasgow.

Contradiction: Allowing the story of "Town Meeting Awakenment" to move swiftly through the extensive use of Those Who-Care. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Follow-up to Wales Town Meeting nets registrations for rally and new TM dates.

Internal: House of four adults experiences fire chief conversation, Wales site selection and running.

Contradiction: Ensuring that those who show up at the fire get on the ladder and fight. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Newcastle youth group pledges one pound a day for three years (2,000 US). Institute receives invitation to assist leadership of Roman Catholic conference of 200 clergy and religious.

The Lord God says, Now is the time: I will beckon to the nations and hoist a signal to the peoples, and they shall bring your sons in their arms and carry your daughters on their shoulders; kings shall be your foster-fathers and their princesses shall be your nurses. PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum Communautaire training day, done in French, trains nine people representing three phases and three nations (France, England and Columbia).

Internal: English language students increase from one to six as a result of ads in neighborhood shops.

Contradiction: Quickly multiplying by ten the number of initial development contracts. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: The week begins with a Christmas Eve youth dance, a huge bonfire in the Piazza and midnight mass and ends with a victorious New Year's Eve dance. Community leadership decides to take on responsibility for the project at midweek Comitato meeting.

Internal: Experience of discontinuity at a time in which even more happens than usual as visitors from Paris and Rome spend time in Termine; House celebrates Christmas with midnight mass followed by a 2 a.m. dinner and prepares to meet a new quarter of victory with three days of planning.

Contradiction: Pushing against the Italian trend of away from villages by deciding to do rural communities. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: A bulldozer and grader arrive to clear industrial site, new farm and roads. A chainsaw inkinded to enable clearing. All electrical supplies and a generator is inkinded and delivered for street lighting.

Internal: House participates in Christmas dinner at guardians home with turkey, dressing and four kinds of ice cream.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

Contradiction: Wrapping up the details of an abundant December. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus facility provides space for Area Brussels training of TM steering committee and workshop leaders, with Nexus troops participating as staff.

Internal: Collegiums and Ecclesiola study of Time essay, "Challenging the Inevitable" launches quarter of depth reflection.

Contradiction: Setting internal time designs that enable the pace to meet the external demands. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Area Council puts all on "death ground" re: Town Meeting, Development and GWF, resulting in radical troop assignments and weekly area maneuver weekends. Eight car companies are contacted for car loans for Quarter III and Quarter IV.

Internal: House celebrates the birth on Christmas Day of Saskia Rebecca to Jon and Margaret Wenge.

Contradiction: Keeping on top of the practical requirements of the maneuvers - money, cars and child care without losing sight of each week's victory. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Noord follow-up visit results in HRM and TM possibilities. Persons from the Jordaan and Etten-Leur decide to attend Belgian TMs. House collects 330 francs developed monies.

Internal: Ecclesiola sparkles with House and sojourners as Kees Schrijnen is guest.

Contradiction: Finding the way to exploit the advantage of the Belgian victory to yield a Netherlands TM breakthrough. (Wk. 4)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Community organizes itself to plan for Kreuzberg Ost quarterly planning council. New volunteer waiter in cafe has all the ladies swooning. Area Frankfurt quarterly planning council is held in Augustinian Retreat Center in West Germany. Developed monies for week include 1,000 DM from retreat center house mother for support of an Indian village project, 1,800 DM from Hamburg church bazaar sponsored by elders and 3,050 DM raised by another church in Hamburg.

Internal: Charles and Doris Hahn arrive for management trek and Charles joins Area Frankfurt for quarterly planning council.

Contradiction: Implementing all project and areal priorities with finesse. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: U.S. ambassador's visit to the Project is firmed up for December 27. Wednesday evening guild conversation is led by ofne of the guilders, symbolizing the emerging decision of the community to take over the Project leadership.

Internal: House children are scared out of their wits as Rich Michael becomes Santa at House Christmas party. Reflection on Development reveals the necessity for a consistent push on Development with people from the community being involved.

Contradiction: Forging the concrete images to implement a broad picture of the future. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS is on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradiction: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers that assure victory. (Wk. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: nadian embassy provides funding for fish farm. Public electric lighting is turned on. Architecture students of Ain Sharms University are assigned to design Bayad Plaza as class project. Bishop Samuel of Coptic Orthodox Church proclaims victory in a visit to Bayad by saying, "I now see the real 'human' development that is going on here."

Internal: Village family (Tanyas Farag Saad) request internship in House.

Contradiction: Forming the local management systems and structures to ensure the victory of having development in village hands. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Five Village Meetings are held during discontinuity. Front running village for new project passes all tests to date with fantastic Village Meeting, authorization and receptivity. Four out of five Village Meetings add new yellow to Kenya map; Director General of Muslim Council wants VM in every Muslim village in Kenya and they will pay. Unexpected K.Shs. 21,000 arrives in mail.

Internal: First trainee to be sponsored by the Muslim Council arrives at project with suitcase in hand.

Contradiction: Taking anxieties about imminent shifts as motivation rather than paralysis.. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: Press reporters visit at instigation of State Bank of India. Guardian hosts two demonstration visits. Largest Continental Council held with a total of 314 assigned to Nava Gram Prayas as HDTS graduates 114 students-largest yet. Preschool Training Module begins in Maliwada for 10 days.

Internal: Health Acceleration Team sent out to Vaviharsh Health Training Module.

Contradiction: Aligning auxiliary and village in preparing for Quarter III battleplanning. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: City Bank runs quarter page advertisement highlighting Maliwada project in major India papers. Tata's Taj Mahal H made the first installment on Chikhale sponsorship. House meets the vice-president of the Century Rayons who shows keen interest in sponsoring a village.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY)

Internal: Christmas. Eve was celebrated with which treats thirty-one souls to the finest Keralili feast, exchange of gifts, carol singing and the arrival of Hemalatha and Kavitha from Calcutta.

Contradiction: Establishing the interior modes for Ashram Operations which will enable devising the service structures to meet the needs of the explosion of Nava Gram Prayas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: In village shramdam, preshcool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industires meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspur to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: GWF with 26 elite women gives new authorization base.

Internal: Swirl of guests for GWF and development happens. Marie Paul goes to Chandigarh to enable Dethe family after the death of Monini's sister, Rohini.

Contradiction: Refocusing energy after GWF breakthrough. (Wk. 11)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First trip of the year is to Jamshedpur, center of Tata, one of the biggest engineering complexes in India. Inkind travel for the trip augers well for village project support in eastern India. Participants leave for the new Training School in Maliwada, 36 hours train journey away.

Internal: New station and commission assignments take effect and give concrete form to the new year as job-hunting continues.

Contradiction: Ensuring each activity is effectively related to the comprehensive and the necessary deed, using maneuver and other movemental screens. (Wk. 2).

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: GCF task force completes Malaysian-Indonesian workbook mock-up. Two Indonesians and one Malaysian are sent to CTC in Australia. Visit to the Registry of Companies and Registry of Societies in Singapore readies registration thrust.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS)

Internal: House welcomes Miriam Rumpf, Peggy Wiltse's mother from Seattle as guest continue to double the number of assigned Nexus troops for seventh week in a row.

Contradiction: Finishing models to get them on the road. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: GCF task force does back-up and planning for major campaign in Southeast Asia. Sarawak State Development officer submits HDP proposal to deputy state secretary.

Internal: Quarterly battleplanning is completed as Sungai Aup House meets together for first time since September.

Contradiction: Moving with precision while clouded by ambiguity about future location and field of engagement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Many and varied activities keep people of the village and the auxiliary busy as they clean irrigation ditches to padi field, hold Imaginal Education Course in Port Dixon for the Tadika teachers, divert river to prepare for the dam building. Women of the village engage in the first industry, gloves. A new English teacher is recruited, demonstration garden is started and the game of badminton flourishes as the youth sports program gets underway.

Internal: House welcomes three sojourners, sends three staff out to teach Indicative Process Methods to women's division of the Malaysia Trades Union Congress in Malacca, and sends Michael Gordon-Smith back to Australia and the Economic Intensification Trek on to Indonesia.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum after Eco-trek as different colleagues move in and out of the village. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Pak Yos from Ciba-Giegy comes to guild meeting to make agricultural presentation to 45 people and gives the guild a new sprayer for insecticide. Indo-ad photographers come to take pictures for in-kind Kelapa Dua brochure. Meeting with the Lurah, headman for the village and the surrounding area signifies new cooperation for agricultural programs.

Internal: New assignments are made for teams, stakes, and housing as the Nugroho family is sent to Australia and Laurie Mitchell and Jelawai Ambas arrive; Soehardi travel to Australia for the CTC and new sojourner. Nurul, recent graduate of a nearby technical school arrives, bringing with him a wealth of local contacts.

Contradiction: Enabling leadership to make decisions on behalf of the whole village. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House deepens relationship with local colleagues while visiting homes during holidays and hosting on New Year's Eve. Area Council in Singapore reinforces the global vision in midst of struggle with area needs and the formation of consensus, taking into consideration the three nation situations.

Internal: Discontinuity and Christmas after Area Council refreshes and renews troops for the development of the face of the mission in Sumatra relative to expansion and awakenment.

Contradiction: Making the leap to do quarter planning rather than waiting. (Wk. 2)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development treks visit Seoul and Tokyo.

Trek begins in Nam Wai. Davao Consult at Langub begins with more than 40 Guardians from the Philippines. One ton of in-kind paper is shipped free to Manila for Davao Consult document.

Internal: House hosts Jane Miller on her way back to Seoul and Maureen Jenkins on her way to Davao.

Contradiction: Getting on the other side of immediacy to work out the entire picture. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Travel funds are raised and tour is sent out to the Korean HDTs, including Wong Ching-On of the auxiliary staff. Economic Acceleration trek arrives and triggers new mushroom and electronics industries. Village landowners agree to sell land to the village for economic ventures. Villagers complete football pitch field and celebrate with a rousing game of soccer. Elders decide to financially support the preschool.

Internal: The auxiliary takes first hot shower in eight months in newly built shower cubicle.

Contradiction: Firming up self-support base in the midst of an acceleration of economic programs with limited troops. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: The ducks arrived in Hai Ou, giving reason for the villagers to work all week to build the facility, install electricity and running water, and secure a brooder and manager. The week was celebrated when the 500 baby ducks began living in their new home.

Internal: John Sung arrives for a two-day visit and Michael Tong comes to sojourn; Charles Tsao visits on Tuesday to enable the stake meetings in Chinese.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the first sign of the fish pond intensification. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Ten consultants from Manila corporations go to Langub HDP.

Internal: Entire House is impacted by style of generalship exhibited in film "MacArthur."

Contradiction: Separating anxiety issues from life and death issues. (Wk. 2).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Taipei House sets 20 appointments with major international companies in Taiwan in preparation for the Area Hong Kong Development maneuver.

Internal: In the midst of plumbing repairs and hot water restoration, the House receives, hosts and sends out area colleagues for Korea HDTs, Taipei Development maneuver, Hai Ou HDP, Nam Wai Economic Acceleration trek, and the Davao Consult.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum on several major fronts by attending to the tactical details which catalyze the support of many colleagues. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Regional Director of Health and Culture agrees to train four villagers in electricity technology to prepare them to run the Sudtonggan Electric Company. Shrimp traps in first week of successful operation catch two kilos a day which sell for up to 30 pesos a kilo. Second Buri factory in first week of operation brings total employed in Buri to 70 now.

Internal: Morning study of Philippine national hero, Jose Rizal, informs long-range vision of Philippine local man.

Contradiction: Creating new team effectivity out of Lone Rangers, shifting from 007 to Star Wars crew. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Coca-Cola donates entrance sign to Langub Human Development Project. Pillars go up on Langub Barangay Hall during community work week in preparation for Consult with 100 local people participating. Community meeting registers 25 full-time consultants with more possibilities still to come. Community plans enablement and assignments for Consult week. General Ahorro of the Philippine Constabulary gives military authorization for the LHDP.

Internal: Four attend baptismal celebration for granddaughter of Francisco Dizon, a major donor - a major social event in the city where many people who have not been in their offices at this time of year were found.

Contradiction: Nailing down the commitments to assure consultants in the necessary consult arenas.

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: First Tokyo ICA volunteers meeting is a great help in understanding Japanese government structures and agencies. Key Tokyo Guardians meet to plan upcoming Guardians breakfast. Warner Lambert donates 120,000 yen (\$500 US).

Internal: Joseph Kim, 16-year old Korean sojourner, is sent out to Jeju Human Development Training School.

Contradiction: Planning the events that will intrigue and engage the Japanese colleagues and Guardians who are emerging out of the woodwork. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Six hundred heads of lettuce are planted in vinyl house as demonstration. The preparation of the HDTS is being kicked toward the goal as massive amounts of decor are constructed.

Internal: House is crowded with colleagues and guests who come for the preparation of HDTS.

Contradiction: Creating the practical and objective vision which will clarify and make possible a common plan. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House translates nine modules for HDTS, recruits participants, sends three faculty to Jeju, intensifies grassroots funding campaign, and receives \$26 bag of inkind sugar for the school.

Internal: Whole House takes two days to build Quarter III maneuvers.

Contradiction: Funding HDTS, a Consult and a new HDP in one month. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The guild group recruits and helps bring off a House demonstration Chikii Kon Dankai, ; in addition, one House member enables, along with Rev Goto, an HRM in Naha.

Internal: Maureen Jenkins returns from Langub Consult.

Contradiction: Creating solid structures which lead to intentional scheduling of events. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Menagawa, Fukuoka Guardian, misses Osaka's Guardian meeting because train service was down, but comes the next day and visits, goes on Development calls, continues work on the authorization frame for the Movement and firms up date for Himeji TM. Mrs. Taka, GWF grad, makes GWF calls in her own community and finds, to her surprise, 15 women ready to participate in February 5 GWF because they are eager for a new style of corporateness.

Internal: Neighbor-colleague tells landlord ICA story and disuades him from raising the rent. Corporateness sparks

Emerging Generation's imagination of fellowship in a dinner of roots and of unity in creating wall decor, including a chick farm from Oombulgurri study.
Contradiction: Getting people to do TM rather than telling ICA it is a good idea. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Sapporo cross country ski course is visited while exploration for local ski course is expanded. Physical survey forms are distributed for daily stake walk check. Stake maps and decor are prepared for stake meetings. Battleplan is built for Early Learning Center, with opening scheduled in January, 1978. On Wee II, 40 towns are visited by five circuit teams to break open TM in Hokkaido.

Internal: New assignment formation into guild arenas maximizes program expansion. Thanksgiving party with local residents introduces new customs. Three new jobs are obtained for self-support.

Contradiction: Pushing through Project programs and area maneuvers with troops on hand. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Yallops leave on Brisbane donor circuit in inkind car with inkind paper for second,000 Aboriginal workbooks, and a final gathering of materials for OHDP celebration on January 26.

Internal: Kim Thornton comes through on Committee of 1,000 circuit with eight committed, moving toward 20 for this quarter. Judi White lands job with John Fairfax newspapers. Area is impacted by reports of Community Youth Forum as they daily increase their goal for an Oombulgurri safari.

Contradiction: Using troops, time and space strategically. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Caltex makes unsolicited donation. Regional colleague goes to CTC as faculty. Iron colleague says yes to GWF core and Committee of 100.

Internal: Tribal resettlement becomes necessary event as House members become attached to rooms.

Contradiction: Risking selves in discovering new gemstones, or being constantly about expanding the territory. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE DARWIN

External: "\$430 catch" says there must be more out there. Oombulgurri completion gain momentum.

Internal: School breaks for long summer holidays.

Contradiction: Maintaining a vision beyond immediate irritations and annoyances. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Another building project is completed as Oombulgurri now has a jetty to unload small freight and passengers. More of the community shows up to work than on any other project.

Internal: House sends out primary school teacher, Margaret Halloran, after year of joyous abandon to OHDP.

Contradiction: Naming and preparing the cast that will be up front on the Completion Celebration Day. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Operation Air Pig comes to victorious conclusion as Oombulgurri work team returns, having braved rain, floods, and the unknown while completing airport, saddled and piggery building.

Internal: Successful New Horizons Emerging Generation

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE)

program is completed and the Emerging Generation is sent out to Houses with more finely tuned Three Campaigns skills. Six out of seven sent to CTC from Adelaide have decided to intern, four in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Utilizing the limited experience of House troops with Aboriginals, as the necessary launching pad for the Walkabout Aboriginal Community Meetings. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Melbourne is represented in person and by telegram of congratulations at Oombulgurri Completion Celebration while Victorian State aboriginal situation is clarified with productive meeting with Aboriginal Support Group.

Internal: CTC grads and Emerging Generation return from fantastic two-week Odysseys as House launches into new curriculum for quarter, including first session of ecclesiola on the Hero/Man/Deed.

Contradiction: Deciding to live with schizophrenia relative to seven missional fronts and holding them in creative tension. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Federal and state government departments are visited for tying up public sector participation on Coroborree, Oombulgurri's first phase completion. Brisbane Department of Aboriginal Affairs wants ICA to look in Queensland for expansion of Aboriginal HDP.

Internal: House hosts Liz Banks' sister and her husband, Dr. Stephanie and Henry Hopton, old colleagues from Adelaide, who are surprised and enthusiastic about HDP. Invitations are printed for Guardians Meeting.

Contradiction: Oiling the wheels of the summer whirlwind. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Advertisement in newspaper for teacher for Oombulgurri yields urban aborigine who says yes to CTC prior to joining Walkabout team. Local Catholic Church comes up with scholarship to help pay CTC fees. Seventy-five pounds of seed and bookshelves are inked and air freighted free to Oombulgurri.

Internal: House celebrates New Year's by spending the week battleplanning programs for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Finding a way to get a committed "yes" from the resources at our disposal. (Wk. 2)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

External: Life in the stakes is occasioned by activity as six action guilds gather in the front yard of the House and disperse to six tasks.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a weekly happening as construct is on target for here and now.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum that draws forth engagement from the stakes. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: House visits local church to discover Jude Samson as guest preacher from Majuro. Dr. vio Annandale invites metro cadre to assist her in organizing the United Nations project, "Year of the Child". The community garden is completed.

Internal: Rev. Jude Samson and Hanson Lalimo visit the House during the consultation; six men and seven lawnmowers cut the grass in one hour.

Contradiction: Finding appropriate tasks to claim engagement of metro cadre and interested eople in HDP preparation. (Wk. 4)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: The Great Northern March on Oregon picks up momentum as Cal Hoss, Order Youth on mid-semester college break, joins the circuiting teams. Twenty-two people from the region gather for RS-I, including three from Wendell Clutz's church in Watsonville. The Fresno cadre met for the first time in five years, in itself a miracle.

Internal: The youth cluster attends a Harlem Globetrotter's game, culminating a week remembered for its collegiums, one to reground all in the dynamics of RS I and another on the Saint as a face of Profound Humanness.

Contradiction Maintaining the tension between one thrust for the whole House and the power of operating as four Patrols. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Final clean-up of San Jose House readies it for sale. Eight buyers want House and good deal is set for December 15.

Internal: Attendance of San Jose women at the Global Womens Forum and interior decision are key events of GWF on peninsula.

Contradiction Creating the practical forms for missional task of the metro cadre. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Weekend California Planning Meeting is held in Oak Park Church, with all meals and for motels inked. The key 11 maneuvers for California focus on Development, HDP preparation and impact.

Internal: Sacramento Metro Cadre decides to hold monthly ecclesiola meetings and weekly GWF and church impact task forces.

Contradiction: Developing a metro cadre manual that holds tension between comprehensive and particular. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Internal: Rest of House travels to Oregon to join colleagues there for House Church, returning to begin packing for House move.

Contradiction: Making the move of the House an exciting adventure, not a tiring chore. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Mail order strategy in New Mexico nets 17 TMs so far with circuiters still in their inkind motel rooms, while at the western front, the L.A. Times and The est Graduate Reveiw feature articles about the Training School, Maliwada Maliwada and Integrity. Old and new colleagues, excited about the Maliwada and Nadlapur HDPs, bring refreshing new spirit to ecclesiola.

Internal: Celebrational spirit explodes at House Church as real trumpet fanfare announces Charles McDermott's birthday; Woltjers host dinner for pastor from the Central Valley to solicit support and future engagement in the California Project.

Contradiction: Designing ecclesiolas so that interested people with diverse Movemental experience can participate in an authentic way that leads to further engagement. (Wk. 4)

Internal Area prior reports to metro and reflects on the future of the Order, using Bonhoeffer's cost of discipleship.

Contradiction Keeping fronts moving on Development, Colorado TMs support base while focus is on Week 8's GWF (Wk 4)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Team goes to area maneuver, B.C., via "Golden"; Duffy goes to B.C via Anchorage. The rest, three in youth cluster, two Emerging Generation and one adult, send out region newsletter.

Internal Ecclesiola is a great happening with a new grasp of three levels of consciousness and new look grid of House

Contradiction Maintaining House structures when involved with immediate necessities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External First week of B.C. Forum Maneuver wins five Forums in Vancouver Island, all set for next week. Corporation blitz breaks loose Vancouver Development and in-kind food, hotel rooms, paper and fills saddle bags of circuiters Regional colleagues fill circuit and logistics roles.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Western Front of the Lone Star Stampede holds two and schedules 11 TMs as House prepares state mailing. Borden county, where the only human settlement had said no, falls to wild possibility as TM is held under auspices of FHA.

Internal: Metro support for ecclesiola enlivens evening with reflections on gridding living space

Contradiction: Maximizing evening and weekend time to cover distant gaps in counties. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Circuiters and House forces from Dallas, Houston and San Antonio gather here for debriefing and celebration. Circuit teams split for "Sunday Punch" setting TM dates in four towns.

Internal: In-kind celebration at the Tower of the Americas in revolving restaurant is great event. Helen Haug arrives to sojourn and leaves for circuit.

Contradiction: Dealing with time and troops to reschedule counties with initial blocks. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Youth and colleagues decide to do Oklahoma City Public School CYF pilot.

Internal: Week of youth engagement is marked with youth prior leading ecclesiola study and celebration of Tina Slicker's eighth birthday.

Contradiction: Creating the new network of care that focuses all the forces into one common thrust on the other side of a saturated geography. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Set up for Lone Star Stampede continues with one page brochure completed and teams sent to San Antonio and Lubbock from sector meeting in Dallas. Original director of Gaosl for Dallas, Dr. Bryant Godbold, visits House for very successful discussion of Town Meeting program in Texas.

Internal: Emerging Generation presents Saturday night play "Kawangware: Place of Glory" with champagne and chocolate chip cookies.

Contradiction: Intensifying effectiveness on two fronts of Lone Star Stampede which are both over five hours away. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: A proposal is submitted to EDA at their request, accompanied by four Pace citizens beginning a course in small business management. Final decision is made on annexation area in comprehensive plan.

Internal: The celebration of the completed life of Barbara Joan Smith takes place on Saturday, January 28, with whole House's integral participation in both practices and drama.

Two TMs were held in the ice in West Tennessee and three TMs were set by three teams on Saturday. Xerox, Pacers, county supervisors and businessmen sign up as Mississippi TM advocates. Amid the snow and ice, troops travel to New Orleans for last-minute briefing to take Mississippi.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

House receives its first significant contribution ever in the form of a \$500 check from the Trust Company Banks of Georgia.

Internal: Local colleague couple invite selves to ecclesiola and arrive with steak and chicken for all as "The New Castle" study provides basis for spin-offs on Profound Humanness.

Contradiction: Breaking open self-support so that another circuit team can get on the road. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: The Tarheel Cotillion maneuver dances along: 13 TMs held, \$6,150 promised.

Internal: Self-support team creates a consultant brochure for the long sword and lands temporary office job for the short sword. Youth lands CETA position to do TM office work maintaining the maneuver's momentum and corporateness.

Contradiction: Developing field contacts that can allow TM set-up over the phone. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Four TMs are completed in the last week and one half a strong possibility for self-support comes from a local congregation seeking interim education leader.

Internal: A combination circuit/retreat/TM recruiting effort both refreshes and amazes as the awesome need for methods is revealed among fellow clergy at their annual gathering.

Contradiction: Bypassing built in bureaucratic sluggishness at making decisions. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Circuiters are sent out to four state campaigns in ongoing effort to supply the special forces troops. Team leaves for Ivy City economic trek, experiencing wave of great success while there.

Internal: Wedge teams from Africa and India return, bearing miracle stories of key authorization and development contacts. Research Centrum works on a corporate pull-together of collective wisdom on group methods, and, in so doing, recovers excitement about methods.

Contradiction: Effectively tying together troop needs here with global demands for funding, circuiters and treks. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Simultaneous attack is made on contradiction from many fronts: Development \$8,000 in hand and breakthrough in local TM funding; 5th citizens rebuild community center boiler and do economic intensification trek in Ivy City; Iron Man statue is presented to senator Percy and H.U.D. releases major funding for housing development.

External: Missouri Waltz maneuver holds 62 TMs in two weeks with first contact with community being the TM evening. Consistent is the encounter with the community's yes to engagement.

Internal: Enablement by student cluster makes 62 TMs a tranquil sea.

Contradiction: Communicating the new in TM saturation with images to further release Global Community Forum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Iowa Farm Bureau Federation agrees to host TM Assembly at their new facility in Des Moines; 18 TMs are set with 64 more to go. Two Development visits yield \$550 for TM: Iowa

Internal: House welcomes Dedinia Nones on reassignment from Chicago Nexus.

Contradiction: Releasing troops to sustain the momentum. (Wk 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Fantastic weekend training event gets colleagues infected with TM/GSD fever through mail order set-up model and site selection issues forum. Troops return from week in Kansas City reporting on the most radical new Town Meeting set-up models since Oklahoma 100.

Internal: Sojourner decides to stay an extra three days to care for sick Emerging Generation after being released from her circuiting commitment. House takes advantage of blizzard as stranded colleagues and permeators join in to decor corporate space and prepare for new Town Meeting campaign.

Contradiction: Broadening the awareness of the growing momentum in the metro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Celebrative mood of continental council, area council and bimetro council planning meeting calls forth plans for fantastic New Year's eve.

Internal: Newsletter and Xerox address labels are all printed inkind by Blackhawk Corporation.

Contradiction: Maintaining TM momentum during season of celebration. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Town Meeting: Indiana continues to move as four more TMs are held, completing the Northeastern 9, while Lafayette and Indianapolis cadres move on seven new counties each. GWF looks good in Lafayette for February 11 with 33 registered and a \$10,000 proposal submitted for 10 more around the state this spring.

Internal: Metro and House colleagues gather for House Church and send Mig Wildhack out to Africa for the Kenyan and Zambian Consults.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebrates 20th Century renaissance from Hillman (rural Michigan) to Detroit to Cairo.

Contradiction: Engaging leadership present in the region for future involvement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Initial work on battleplan for Kentucky counties and Quarter III result ts in exciting palm for all fronts.

Internal: House life battleplanning to care for urban mission and support systems for Quarter III happens.

Contradiction. Expanding forces in midst of battlefield coverage. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Day II and Week II forces, including colleagues, are pulling off a post-gold TM maneuver in New York turf.

Internal: Sending out the fourth areal troops to Area Houston, two more to Ivy City, House experiences table swelled by colleagues Soo Young, Paul Evans, the area strike force and Global Development forces.

Contradiction: Moving out on maneuvers with intuition as a guide while models are still mutating. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: The Samurai visit results in identification of future consultants for HDPs and possibility of local congregation Adopt-a-village.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality releases non-residents and first

time guests to deal with space symbolically.

Contradiction: Building the vision that releases the revolutionary spirit in local activity (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: In the midst of planning Finger Lake Folly and Western Loop circuits, the House sets four appointments for CYF and receives a copy of a letter submitted with proposed Village Adoption Program. Acquaintances lead to further contacts in the black community of Rochester which begin the refraining process long overdue in order to market CTY, GWF.

Internal: House members are sent home from work and school because of expected bad weather (that has not arrived yet).

Contradiction: Building the designs that compensate for the fall-out. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

Internal: Ten people attend ecclesiola and several work into the evening on comprehensive TM mailing list.

Contradiction: Creating the contexts for engaging in the necessary tasks vs. projects. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: The death of one of the young adults in Ivy City during the Christmas holidays is lifted up in a community memorial service. The service honors all 13 Ivy City residents who died during 1977 as well as one preschooler who died in January. Bricks and mortar are inkinded for preschool renovation, now in full swing.

Internal: New quarter calls for relooking at symbolic life assignments and rationales.

Contradiction: Balancing immediate indicatives over against long-range strategies. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Two metro circuits to southern Maryland and western Maryland uncover RS-I prospect not seen in four years who enables scheduling of TM in new county and first two registrations for Maryland Assembly

Internal: House welcomes Ted Buxton from Detroit at ecclesiola. He arrived in the sunny south in time for worst blizzard in 15 years.

Contradiction: Articulating role of ICA as resource to local communities when the expectation of a national group is activist orientation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Two circuit teams set up an average of 2.4 TMs per day for the full 24 in 10 days. The worst storm in 20 years does not prevent 12 TMs from happening.

Internal: Collegium room takes on fiesta decor as House sends Jim Kelly out to Cano Negro.

Contradiction: Deepening the engagement of the GSF through taking responsibility for metro circuits. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Area strike force inkinds car for circuiting in New Jersey and discovers entrees to other car dealers. TM New Jersey Assembly participants are re-visited as strongholds to launch township level saturation in Monmouth county.

Internal: Metro colleagues cover orchestration of four TMs in Pennsylvania state campaign during Week 1 of Week 4.

Internal: Quarter is highlighted by two deaths and two marriages. House struggles to discern the appropriate meal-time conversations.

Contradiction: Controlling the sense of frantic-ness in light of an incomplete mission and Christmas discontinuity. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of House is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

288 External: Northern circuit team has 4 out of 5 counties with dates. River Valley in Nipissing county sends 25 of its 150 residents to Forum. All were in trapping, hunting or lumber businesses and three spoke English.

Internal: Reception for Marguerite LePage prior to India assignment allows old colleagues to get together for the first time in three quarters.

Contradiction: Appropriation. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community involvement is intensified and broadened as the Health Trek trains ten new community health visitors at the same time that 30 community leaders participate in candlelight dinners and commit themselves to detailed planning of the next eight months of the Project.

Internal: Auxiliary returns from Christmas discontinuity to participate in a Week II workshop which structures internal life issues, thereby freeing more time for Project issues.

Contradiction: Projecting adequate images of leadership transition as Project programs move from ICA-initiated events to community-initiated events. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Foro Comunitario in Rio Caribe with 189 registered is occasion for great celebration in village and in metro. Cano Negro and two residents out to help enable the Foro. The arrival of the Economic Acceleration Trek helps to launch the week of the Cano Negro Commercial Garden. Nine Venezuelan agricultural experts participate in this event and create a 10-page manual on how to grow papaya and squash. Four hectares of land are prepared for planting. A tree nursery is built in two days by the newly commissioned farm workers, and the week is capped off by a mock wedding between the community and the garden with the newly inked tractor arriving dressed up as a bride and 500 prepared bags of papaya seedlings as the groom. This was followed by a wild fiesta which lasted until the wee hours of the morning.

Internal: House welcomes colleagues from Chicago who challenge intents about effective village economy and celebrates Thanksgiving as part of House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping vehicles out of the garages and on the road. (Wk. 11)

The Meyers Foundation in Australia gives \$ 7,000 for Aboriginal expansion. Quarterly reports are being readied with Singapore reporting US\$ 70,000 and Nairobi \$20,080 for Quarter III. Hong Kong produces a 90-minute tape on their top 50 corporation contacts. HUD officials have a great site visit in Ivy City and announce that Fifth City is HUD's demonstration of a rehabilitated urban community with strong local management the key. The contradiction lies in the arena of effectively tying funding into the Town Meeting breakloose now happening in many locations.

Global Research Centrum reports two signal PSUs, one on the Academy and one on the Community Youth Forums. Both events were staffed by personnel selected from across the Nexus. Both are to be regarded as first in a series of refinement events for the respective programs. Youth figure prominently in this week's research. Chicago youth do extensive refinement work and Australian youth overload on overtime to get to Oombulgurri to do more work. Spotlight also is on training with a Global Academy PSU on construct and course refinement to accord with practical necessity. Human Development Project experiences continue to emphasize the practical dimension of research. At all locations, colleagues stand in need of Profound Humanness reflection and thought, amid practical demands of far more immediate and pressing weight.

Global Operations Centrum reports an extremely active week on all fronts.
