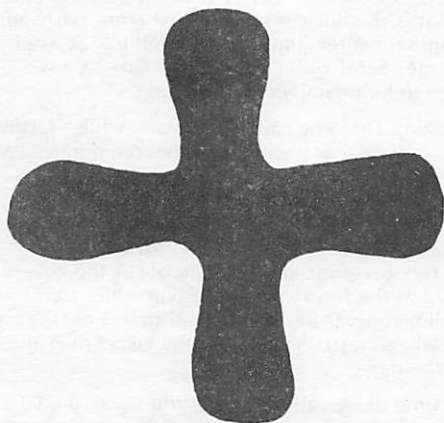

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: United Kingdom goes gold with TM in Claydom Barham: TM in every region. Next phase is every county, which means 40 by Sept. 30. The model for doing the 40 was built in Manchester by area task force over Week 11. New TM workbook appears effective as participants begin to fill it in before the meeting begins.

Internal: Bridge House continues face lift with freshly painted entrances to the grounds and house—gloss! Visitors include David O'Neill to help with the Powerhouse and Stan Duncan (Chicago) on his way home after two years in Algeria.

Contradiction: Grasping the catalytic power of June 30th in relation to next year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Town Meeting UK moves to sub-county level with PSU on July Scotland strategy held with Manchester forces. Key development appointment with chairman of finance corporation discloses whole network of subsidiary companies in India, Africa and Far East.

Internal: It's Ladies Week in Glasgow House as Marge Allan leaves job and boosts Day I forces for the summer; Martha Dempster packs for Tairgwaith and forthcoming marriage, and Lucy Smith brings Italy and France experience to PSU.

Contradiction: Pulling long-lost, far-flung colleagues back into the picture with mid-summer Town Meetings in their own communities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAIRGWAITH HDP

External: Director of Environment, Lhur Valley Borough, rings up Colleagues and tells story of HDP, including the entire story of 5th City. Youth make final plans for bus load to Isle of Dogs June 30th. Carnival plans continue to consume all with stake meetings and plans for *Best Decorated Street* contest. Community store moves step closer through possible purchase decision by Guild.

Internal: The finished bathroom papering symbolically signals the completed move to Tairgwaith. Leaders of Christian Leadership Community spend weekend with auxiliary planning two-week stay for August. Village fills auxiliary refrigerator with garden items.

Contradiction: Doing the work of the summer crucial to the Project in the midst of pulling off carnival planning and actuation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: In the last two weeks, one TM is held and three are set up in counties surrounding Manchester, with a proposal from a social studies professor to use TM as field studies. New Development breakloose with ten appointments — six in untouched region of Leeds.

Internal: Influx as Lucy Smith returns from Italy, J.R. Barnes visits with three campaign reports from Kenya and news of July *Three-Ring Circus Operation* troop help from France, Italy, Brussels and India.

Contradiction: Shaping Phase II Town Meeting Campaign with great influx of troops and new set-up breakthroughs. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Six Community Forums happen this week in Auvergne, Normandie, Pas-de-Calais, Centre, Champagne and Brittany to complete the campaign in all 21 regions of France.

Internal: Incredible feast with food and drink from the 21 golden regions of France (Champagne, Cognac, Bordeaux wine, Roquefort cheese) celebrates the completion of this phase of the campaign.

Contradiction: Using present advantages most effectively. Wk.. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is **Gold!** The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for June 30 with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terinese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakenment flurry. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: First consignment of bedsheets (3840) are hemmed, ironed, folded, bagged, sealed and delivered to distributor; 8400 new sheets are picked up to be finished in ten days. Sixteen established adults from the Muslim Youth League participate in lights workday.

Internal: Three marathon days/nights in one week forces expenditure and creativity.

Contradiction: Getting systems regularized without losing momentum. (Wk. 13)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The 100th TM in Europe and the 33rd in Belgium are completed, giving a boost to Europe going gold.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality focusing on symbolic life is address to all. Grand celebration with champagne and steak marks Belgium going gold.

Contradiction: Doing continental visioning that propels into next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Set-up meetings are scheduled in two more provinces. Four TMs held in Limberg raise up new workshop leaders and orchestrators.

Internal: Kingdom of God collegium and Week II writing of contemporary parables impacts House and Nexus. Send out of CYF team to Germany, Carin Schuchart to Chicago, and two Operations teams to Paris and UK and Hamans to USA 12.

Contradiction: Not stumbling in eagerness to finish Belgium. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: A Development trek to the far reaches of Holland (north and south) results in cash and metro colleague formulation.

Internal: Area budget projections finally in the black! The House experiments with summer evening collegiums. Greg Maxwell, RS-I grad from Salina, Kansas, bicycles through and stays for three days.

Contradiction: Discerning the concrete products of this reflective time that will enable quick fall victories. (Wk. 13)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two Town Meetings are held in the State of Hessen and one in Niedersachsen with 30-50 people participating in each.

Internal: Elizabeth Sands' mother arrives for two-week visit and House plays and picnics with 20 guests for Sunday afternoon *Friends of the Frankfurt House* gathering.

Contradiction: Getting people to the Kreuzberg Project during the next few weeks. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Completion of "Treffpunkt" demonstrates seriousness and adds a touch of sparkle to the street while inkind paint and linoleum worth 1,000 marcs enables interior of treffpunkt to be near completion. First community event is a play by children at local school attended by 100 people.

Internal: House sends out Mary Jane Elliott on Indian dance group tour, shifting responsibilities and enabling new roles.

Contradiction: Expanding the base of community participation and arena in which to develop leadership. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Health Caretakers again impact community as they assist five nursing sisters from the mobile clinic to immunize 69 children against smallpox, measles, polio and DPT. Demonstration home garden catches on with four new ones started in Stake 5 and another in Stake 1. Women's group gains momentum as attendance increases from 16 to 36. They decide to have farming training twice a month from Kawangware's Mutoka, between sewing and cooking lessons. Preschool reopens with 134, following two weeks of teachers' training.

Internal: As cold winter winds make icy sheets and brisk outdoor baths, Kapini construction workers push auxiliary house-training center toward completion, as walls near roofing stage. Send out Thomas and Gibson Mwaisiye to Shantumbu to help families in harvesting.

Contradiction: Thinning auxiliary staff while facing the demand to engage more people from the community. (Wk. 13)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The governor and ten officials of the government claim Bayad as the future hope of Egypt while attending the June 30 celebration. During the day visitors toured the project, talking to villagers, participating in the camel race and other events of the day.

Internal: Time design altered to *hit the street* at 6:00 a.m. to polish the project for June 30. Village and house gather to send Bovins to Chicago for GRA.

Contradiction: Synchronizing troops, materials and plan for effective tactical action. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kamweleni Day is a great event which is highlighted by a bus load of people who arrive on OTC donated bus from Kawangware. The sub-chief of Kawangware is honored by Chief and other officials as they compare notes from the two Human Development Projects. Three-minute phone call has bus and 20 cases of Coke lined up for the day. The 33rd District colored yellow and V.M. set up for final province by Asst. Commissioner of Social Services in Nairobi.

Internal: Christopher Foya gives great witness before being sent out to Consult in Bananiras Human Development Project and vividly illustrates the limits of his life and his discovery of the powerful possibilities within those limits.

Contradiction: Building a winning timeline for the next quarter without getting sucked up in the next two weeks. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Guilds move into action as farmer's guild plants new cooperative nursery. Industrial guild elects one manager for all industries, and the health guild sponsors a cooking class. Community celebrates first meeting in Community Center with hot chocolate and bread added to traditional foods.

Internal: The power of corporateness overshadows inconveniences felt as House moves into facility with light plastic roof and no doors or windows.

Contradiction: Instilling excitement in the community over Kamweleni Open House. (Wk. 13)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes

to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17) and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takali for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25*. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR—KENDUR HDP

External: Shramdan on bus stand tree ring involves 15 villagers in carrying Shabad Stones, inkind labor of two masons, inkind 100 cut stones and 15 rupees are raised for another 100 from local merchants; 34 people are recruited to take loans on cows and 15 recruited to raise papaya for popain.

Internal: New decor highlights the campaign of the 25. One more auxiliary becomes ICA and dons new blue shirt. Auxiliary toilet is completed with new doors attached.

Contradiction: Finding a way for villagers to come up with own resources for village needs and activities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH—VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Auti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a diary scheme, poultry farm and general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON—TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satura, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared by each of six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Manila Mandal has successful GWF in Satura and village sends two women to the Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Galkwad and S. Galkwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI—UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI—SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of *Shivni Voice* is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic look. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON—ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately launched with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyed in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary. House sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI—TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON—MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Three members of Delhi House participate in Nava Gram Prayas as Vivian Paul is doing guiding work in Maliwada, Marie Paul is doing Development in Bombay, Roger is at Vaviharsh and Goethau is on six-week intensification trek. Six villagers from Maliwada come to Delhi to do research in carpet making, as arranged by Birlas.

Internal: Pre-monsoon showers bring down the temperature by several degrees and give new life and energy to the House. Marie Paul returns to begin the preschool and Global Language School.

Contradiction: Keeping the ship afloat in the midst of a raging storm. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Drinking water well is dug to a depth of four meters x 12 meters. More than 150 women of all ages and castes come together to see demonstration of Chaika (cotton spinning), with 34 signed up to work in the Nadlapur Chaika Unit Week 10. Plans have been made to have 50 machines delivered; training continues. This is Nadlapur's first industry. Home demonstrations begin with new cooking techniques and a baby feeding program. Visit from Monitoring and Economic Acceleration launches HDP into week-long battleplanning for implementation of small industries to double the income in one year. Bank loans come in for more than 64,000 rupees. Village vegetable garden begins to pour out produce.

Internal: Staff welcomes Parekh, Slicker, Patterson and Gilles, who allow auxiliary to appropriate seemingly forgotten victories.

Contradiction: Prioritizing time for battleplanning and creating appropriate decor for Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Ambas, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SURUSUP HDP

External: Local Gestetner producer prints Consult brochure. The state government visits, resulting in practical ideas for authorization assistance. Local headman and leaders show enthusiasm to begin HDP immediately.

Internal: House makes final preparations to ready practices for the Consult victory.

Contradiction: Recruiting 30 consultants in one week while at the same time obtaining services and aid. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Four Malaysian families symbolize decision to request global assignments at Area Priors Council.

Internal: Seven young men from nearby vocational training center move into House as sojourners during their one month practical training in helping build Agricultural Complex for the HDP.

Contradiction: Turning the seasonal preoccupations of national elections, rice harvesting, and durians into a catalytic force. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Indonesian Government officially approves proposal for a project in South Sulawesi (BONTOA) six days after proposal was submitted. An 11-member board is formed of villagers for the credit union. Training begins for chicken industry with 13 attending. New rail (bamboo) fence is built along main road through the village. One villager and two Indonesian bridges are repaired in preparation for June 10 celebration.

Internal: James Carmichael, the man in charge of the Canadian Embassy funding programs, brings his wife and two small children to stay overnight at the Project. Soehardi's father visits for one week and helps to harvest mungbeans. Project obtains a bolt of blue cloth and everyone is making a new blue shirt for the 10 June celebration.

Contradiction: Moving the village leadership quickly so that they see that the 10 June celebration as a consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole house is required for Sabah consult. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Sue Oberg sent to Taipei to join Area Prior's Trek and Area Troika Meeting. First results of General Chamber of Commerce mailing on Nam Wai yield free engineering advice from large firm and \$100 check from Bank of New South Wales.

Internal: Participate in Dragon Boat racing fever by attending a race in the New Territories — reviving Chinese festival remembering sixth century BC protest against corruption. Esther Rowe, sojourner, returns from Philippine Odyssey. Nexus gears up for year-end celebration when all house members will be together for first time since Christmas.

Contradiction: Exploding our images and context so we are not caught in a self-created prison of ineffectivity. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Four young adults sent out to Sudtonggan for Completion celebration, one sponsored by his company Duty Free Shoppers to the tune of HK\$1200, and 35 key villagers are present for send out and celebration planning with all ages and phases represented. Meeting and sendout established commitment for our own celebration July 2, 1978.

Internal: The House shifts into second phase of the quarter with a trip to local Chinese restaurant which renews vitality in preparation of rest of quarter. Student volunteer comes back to work in project 3 days a week after the completion of her school intern commitment.

Contradiction: Speeding up the tortoise pace of private and public in relation to the pace of competition. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Newly initiated 4H Club will not be blocked and finds new location to prepare for pig raising project. Village beautification has caught on and villagers now bring new plants for all the planters and assist in the planting and care.

Internal: Weekly collegium of Chinese lessons enables more spontaneous relations with the village.

Contradiction: Learning patience while the village follows through on the tasks constantly slowed down by red tape relative to the practical task. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Community Forum: Philippines completes second phase with only 12 provinces to go in the final week. Movement communities are chosen by governors for Forums to be held in rural villages. A participant from one community without electricity, communication and archaic farming methods said, "The Forum has restored our self-confidence and shows us we can solve our own problems."

Internal: Planning continues to Assembly to be held in conjunction with Sudtonggan two-year completion celebration.

Contradiction: Showing the same possibility in 33,000 villages in the Philippines. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House and metro colleagues from Taipei participate in Hai Ou first anniversary celebration. Exit permits obtained for eight Hai Ou villagers going to mari-cultural exchange visit in the Philippines at Sudtonggan HDP.

Internal: David Yu, Taipei House intern, leaves his job to spend time in Chicago at GRA, Council, Fall Academy and on to a HDTS.

Contradiction: Postponing crucial decisions in task formation and self-support until after July. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Having sent guild leaders out to do forums, new guild leaders respond with a decision to meet every morning at 6:15 for breakfast collegiums and At the same time delivering 57 invitations for World's Fair to village families. Re-doing the guild spaces and preparing square for asphaltting.

Internal: Two village sojourners decide to stay another week, allowing us to celebrate a birthday with spontaneous community dance that is the best celebration of the year.

Contradiction: Capturing the imagination of the village with the World's Fair. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Week begins with two days of imaginal teachers day care training; leadership training with every *sitio* represented is held for Community Planning Assembly which created a quarter timeline on Saturday. 150 cement hollow blocks inkinded from Steel Fabricating Company.

Internal: The House receives Tito De laSerna from Cebu and celebrates the return of Judy Albers from Manila. House sends out Geni, Leroy and Micah Philbrook to GRA Chicago. House receives Elsa Languido as a fellow.

Contradiction: Engaging a broader portion of the total community. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: ICA sets appointment with Nagasaki auxiliary bishop.

Internal: Mr. Goto and Fr. Hikari Goto enable house hunt to go ahead while we build summer curriculum.

Contradiction: Dealing with communication and feed-back within house and within the city. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Colleagues and staff corporately plan the time-design for the Town Meeting Training event. GWF is impacted by their own reflections on the needs for a global sisterhood.

External: Initiated five week development blitz with \$475 in hand and \$3750 working which opens up new networks among architects and accountants, topped off with May 17th advocates event with representatives of six nations and public and private sector.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Texas Town Meeting Summary Report is inked and distributed to 1800 people across the State. Charlotte Graham decides to do anthropology research in Indianoma. One hundred thank you letters are sent to *inkind contributors* for Texas TM.

Internal: Metro and House collate 2,000 TM: Texas Reports, topped off with a midnight enchilada dinner.

Contradiction: Recruiting for GRA '78 when all efforts have been placed on nearby consults. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

Major transformations happened, a few of which are 13 houses painted, hedges renewed, and residents' name signs up. Internal: Compilation of data for Tennessee is a long

process because House repeatedly sings the songs, rereads the stories and proposals. House welcomes back McCabe and sends him out with Kelley Michael to Asherton consult, sends Kathy Addington out for summer and Pat Goad to Indianoma consult. Carol Poole sent to Cincinnati after quickie garage sale unloads junk for \$110 self-support.

Contradiction: Developing rhythm necessary to sustain slim troops to complete the tasks. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Town Meeting in Donaldsonville, Seminole County, with over 60 from the establishment in attendance and \$500 check continues the break-open of Southwest Georgia as the House readies for the massive Georgia push in Quarter IV.

Internal: House spends three days battleplanning for massive Quarter IV push and creates the plan for winning with key state-wide networks, such as Georgia Bankers Association and the County Extension Agents.

Contradiction: Breaking open the entrees that will allow the massive inkind and quick-set victories to hold 130 Town Meetings in Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: First task force meeting on Tuesday has 35 persons present. Surveys are begun with excited local participation. Transformation of inked teacherage for staff housing pulls in more volunteers. Unsolicited \$300 check is received in the mail from a major businessman's memorial fund for the first local development sign.

Internal: Truckloads arrive from the Charlotte House to open the new Charlotte House—Gibson HDP. Living in a trailer gives new images of corporate and private space. House Church is held in training center (old school where Project office is housed) and 22 people appear at the sendout of the Bingham family of five to the Jamaican Consult. Redfields appear as ready and willing colleagues formerly involved in Philadelphia.

Contradiction: Engaging community in corporate maneuvers to prepare for the Consult in two weeks. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Xerox prints Florida Summary Report free and United Telephone sends grant of \$300.

Internal: Church gives two weeks paid so staff can go to Gibson Consult.

Contradiction: Knowing what to do and doing it now to be ready for late August. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Final countdown before GRA sees second floor completion, around-the-clock decorating, and task force assignments finalized. Global travellers from India, Africa and the Philippines arrive.

Internal: The Order celebrates the birth of Mary Louise to Adam and Gayle Thompson. Practics jel as in-kind and Publishing House forces are beefed up. Circuiters return from six USA-HDP Consults.

Contradiction: Enabling a fine GRA to focus on the coming year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

Internal: Office decor updated with document covers from each Kansas Town Meeting and six-color timeline.

Contradiction: Waiting until the Summer Program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Local history night generates enthusiasm for Project. Des Moines Register, Iowa's only state-wide newspaper, spends full day taking pictures and talking to people for a "before" story. They will also cover the Consult and follow up on the Project. VISTA contracts arrive for signature.

Internal: John McAdam, Karen Kivimaki and Asher Ertel arrive to bring auxiliary to full strength. Regional work weekend with 20 colleagues transform hotel into residences and offices.

Contradiction: Preparing 800 people for the coming journey into the new world. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Lorimor Human Development Consult has everyone turned on and going full steam—metro colleagues to put finishing touches on auxiliary accommodations.

Internal: House and Metro celebrate the cluster's school year's end with dinner at Stevenson's Apple Farm.

Contradiction: Maintaining self-support push while sustaining Lorimor Consult dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: As fourth LENS Course ends for the Department of Natural Resources, the largest state department and the third largest landowner in the U.S., 150 staff will have participated in four such courses, for the purpose of learning how to use citizen participation as part of the Department's work and planning.

Internal: House hears report on the four LENS courses from veteran Loudermilk and reflects on the deep necessity to use LENS and other tools to include the established structures around the upcoming HDP town of Kinney, in the creation of the project so that in two years the town will have established the new links with the world that will enable it to continue.

Contradiction: Creating and using the imaginal charts and working decor which hold the accountability and urgency of the task at hand. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: GWF at Babler State Park with 34 women around the table representing St. Louis, East St. Louis, Springfield, Illinois, Kansas City, Missouri and Mill Shoals, Illinois, was a significant bi-state event as all phases were present and strong possibilities for future engagement of women were evident.

Internal: Wrap-up of the GWF day with returning tables to the church, visiting Soulard Market for donations of produce for HDP Consult, returning the borrowed truck, and inking celebration supper and largest mug of beer ever seen, reveals "the wonder of total engagement."

Contradiction: Enabling Mill Shoals HDP. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA-MILL SHOALS HDP

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDP's along the way.

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDP's right here at home. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The House and metro celebrate and participate in US 12 by sending consultants, enablement forces, a patron and actuation forces to Mill Shoals HDP. Two GWF and six Town Meetings are set up for next fall.

Internal: House hosts David and Jackie Speicher's parents and spins tales of US 12 and TM: Indiana. Breakfast out to celebrate the very last county going *gold*, and the rest of us take off for Mill Shoals and GRA.

Contradiction: Standing before both the 100 open doors in Indiana and the global wisdom of GRA '78. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Great Kentucky Cotillion is finished in grand style—all 120 counties are GOLDEN.

Internal: Cotillion celebration with colleagues, with sendout of Jim Armour to the Widen Consult and Shirley St. John to the Alabama Campaign.

Contradiction: Gathering all loose ends in order to focus on the summer. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Held training event for Town Meetings in urban saturation community, involving Michigan Bell community relations staff as volunteer workshop leaders; set up Town Meeting in Michigan's last county for June 8; hosted GWF, CYF, and LENS teams to set up forums as part of saturation.

Internal: Colleague Lois Martin brings acquaintance Gayle Thompson to house, who is interested in doing something with her life. Made call to London to ask to spend at least a year in HDP there or Wales.

Contradiction: Playing the trump we have. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The East End Neighborhood House Training Meeting is highly successful in weaning new Town Meeting grads from ICA leadership to newly awakened community leadership.

Internal: The House installs a revolving door and sends out Lois Reeves and colleague Mike Tippett to Brazil Consult and receives Chris Copley, Mary Poole and Genevieve Morrill on stopoffs along with Jane Booher and Addie Batica on Development.

Contradiction: Maintaining steady beat in midst of summer comings and goings. (Wk. 1)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: The final week of GRA recruitment nets eleven people going to the GRA and raises \$700 for scholarship funding.

Internal: House welcomes Rod Worden returning from Latin American and receives a fine report on Woburn Lawn. The main thrust this week was the publication of our learnings in the arenas of corporate life and area corporateness.

Contradiction: Rendering up the old year with a story of the meaning of the new one. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Metro colleague visits and participates in summer recruitment workshop.

Internal: Collegiums and conversations relative to GRA and next year begin to help us design the future.

Contradiction: Creating a unified summer maneuver that separates necessary things that need to be done from the forever ambiguous. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Push on inkind for HDP while completing invitations for HDP consult recruitment.

Internal: Alice Rose qualifies for city track, and having the Youth Cluster Evaluation completed creates a great impact on the House.

Contradiction: Consults coming up fast, and we are only at the starting gate. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Two more Town Meetings are set for Isle of Wight county saturation.

Internal: House celebrates with Ivy City at House Church.

Contradiction: Quickly firming up commitments that have been made and expanding the GSF base. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON—IVY CITY HDP

External: Community, metro, region and area join in celebration of Eileen MOrriell and George Howard's wedding. Highlight is the community organized shower and bachelor party, as the community's role in a covenant is explored.

Internal: The House hosts families of the wedding party, and sends out representatives to the Gibson HDP Consult and to Fifth City celebration.

Contradiction: Symbolizing the shift from Phase I to Phase II of the project on behalf of the world in Ivy City with a unique celebration. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Seventeen attend stake meetings, where conversation is about store, fire department, health service, and youth activities. Meetings are set to deal with these. Three youth and one adult are sent to enable Gibson HDP Consult.

Internal: Visit by Sister Regina is a demonstration for auxiliary staff on how to write proposals for government funds.

Contradiction: Breaking down old prejudices to turn talk into visible action. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Atlantic County, New Jersey is saturated with the sixth Town Meeting held in Egg Harbor.

Internal: Religious House stands on rock (we stay another year) and not on sand.

Contradiction: Sustaining the motivity of colleagues in the Development push — both those who attend the task force meetings and those who are scattered. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Three major mailings go out this week: a regional newsletter, a mailing about the GRA, following up phoning, and packets to each of the Houses in the area.

Internal: Pedagogy continued this week with great lecture on corporate priorship and breakloose study of community paper.

Contradiction: Naming the eventfulness of the summer. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Twenty attend first meeting to get the programs started, followed by meetings in the arenas of economic, recreation and communication (library and newsletter). The first *Starks Voice* is printed and distributed to each home in the community. One local resident, when given his *Voice*, said, "Starks has a newspaper?" and stared in wonder at the paper in his hand.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Received a letter from the HUNGER PROJECT, commending the ICA highly for its comprehensive approach to community development toward alleviating the problem of world hunger. Also, received a request for a Town Meeting from Danielson, Ct., the site of the recent *Windham County Whammo* saturation.

Internal: The House moved from the spacious privacy of a 75-room facility to a much closer six-room facility.

Contradiction: Focusing energies outward on model-building for the mission of Quarter I.. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTE VILLE HDP

External: Schoolyard transformed beyond belief, which was enabled by local inkind victories; and those who do not usually work together participate in transformation.

Internal: Metro support booms as weekend overflows with 19 supporting workers and visitors; Andrew Harvey arrives for one month sojourn.

Contradiction: Enabling community healing. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House sees double as it focuses simultaneously on enabling Starks HDP and "Windham Whammo" County Saturation in Connecticut with five Town Meetings this week. Consultants, enablers, and visitors are sent off to Starks Consult at evening slide show and briefing.

Internal: Campaign Night activities consist of metro colleagues taking full responsibility for orchestrating the Killingly, Ct. Town Meeting.

Contradiction: Attaining use of wheels to take in-kind materials and people to the Starks Consult. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House works on Area and National reports to take to the summer, producing first draft of Canadian CFC Brochure and the National Proposal Chart (with 72 proposals).

Internal: House participates in Quebec's Fete National St. Jean Baptistes on 24th of June with singing and dancing in the streets of Old Montreal, bonfires, and fireworks, concerts and music. Six youth attend ecclesiola while Wilbur Leatherman brings global greetings from Delta Pace and TM: USA on his way to the Coady International Institute in Nova Scotia.

Contradiction: Maintaining the urgent missional thrust, amidst diverse assignments and approaching summer program. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of house is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: With self-support a major unresolved issue, a Week II PSU on consulting services was held and a mailer was created with the objective of \$50,000 in fees for 78-79.

Internal: The Hai Ou song with a melody that haunts us with the East permeates our week as we deliberate on next year's global and area objectives.

Contradiction: Clarifying practical contradictions in order to understand the overall maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Newly formed task team beginning work on New Day Canada Assembly for fall, symbolized the victory in hand relative to 12 visible miracles in process for June 30 global celebration.

Internal: Intensification of Project symbolized by the arrival and departure of troops. Creation of a guardian of the symbolic for each week and completing plans for the task forces for the summer.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between optimizing accomplishments for the summer and giving attention to leadership training and formation. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Long-awaited week of CHA, Cano Negro Hacia Adelante, arrives including scavenger hunt, parades, Community Assembly, workdays and Health Agricultural Fair in which seven agencies participate: Inkind nets new Gestetner, refrigerator, 500 reams of paper, kitchen supplies and whole cow for HDTS. Faculty works on HDTS adaptation. Foro Comunitario in Maracaibo for Rotary youth is a great success.

Internal: Staff sends out Paul Calhoun to the Academy and celebrates with village the ending of the week of CHA.

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTS and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAMP NAVA GRAM PRAYAS

External: In the middle of Indiana, the three Indian villages of Kendur, Vaviharsh, and Kolombi spring up overnight.

Internal: Living Environment module and Village Agriculture module occasion the planting of gardens and the building of rabbit hutches for six rabbits.

Contradiction: Contexting the arriving staff as you context the arriving children. (Wk. 1)

Global Research Centrum reports strong responses coming in from HDTS participants and many requests for a record Australian HDTS. CYF team reports two great CYF events in Philippines held after trek team had departed and staffed completely by nationals trained by the trek team. The contradiction lies in the arena of seeing that corporate brooding keeps the sharp edge on missional doing.

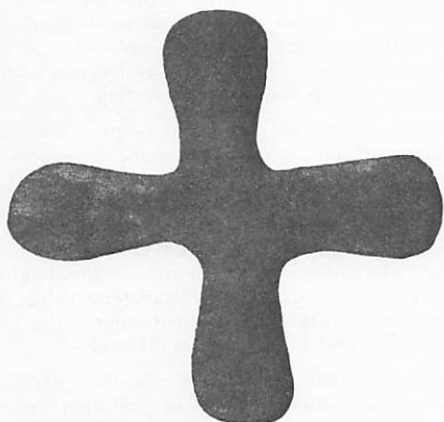

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: *June 30th* celebration highlighted by Island Tour and visit to Power House to see signs and displays of Project accomplishments. Greater London Council Re. John Branagan extols ICA as "modern day apostles that have awakened the Isle of Dogs" at feast of dishes from each of 24 HDPs at the Bridge House. Over 150 colleagues and friends participate in Saturday football match between Isle of Dogs youth and Tairgwaith.

Internal: Arrivals and reports from Kreuzberg Ost, Kawangware and Maliwada projects enliven *June 30th* celebration.

Contradiction: Turning the momentous event of *June 30th* into new advantages for both Isle of Dogs and Town Meeting. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Secretary/Treasurer of Carnegie Foundation helps with advice on how to present winning proposal for Tairgwaith. Area telephone and mail messages symbolize the *golding* of the United Kingdom.

Internal: David Cunningham spends Week II and brings first-hand information to Development appointment. House attends Orange Lodge Parade of Hundreds; the House Agricultural Guild reaps 8 radishes from first harvest in backyard.

Contradiction: Gearing up with winning plan for doing the Regions in Scotland during the "Quiet Time." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: The week of final carnival prep culminates with *Best Dressed Street* contest and catalyzes stake consciousness. Significant visit with area businessmen provides concrete possibilities for development of industry in the village. Football team journeys to Isle of Dogs for completion celebration and have "time of their lives" sightseeing, playing football and participating in Island Social.

Internal: Reflective conversation on significance of carnival provides context for engagement. House welcomes Martha Dempster to the Project. In-kind vegetables continue to pour in from Tairgwaith *Green Grocer*.

External: In the last two weeks, one TM is held and three are set up in counties surrounding Manchester, with a proposal from a social studies professor to use TM as field studies. New Development breakloose with ten appointments — six in untouched region of Leeds.

Internal: Influx as Lucy Smith returns from Italy, J.R. Barnes visits with three campaign reports from Kenya and news of *July Three-Ring Circus Operation* troop help from France, Italy, Brussels and India.

Contradiction: Shaping Phase II Town Meeting Campaign with great influx of troops and new set-up breakthroughs. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is **Gold!** The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for *June 30* with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terminese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakening flurry. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Oba and Chiefs Council demonstrates authentic establishment of community consensus through once again practically articulating support of the project; ITI circuit leaves for Eastern Nigeria; Ijaye TM scheduled.

Internal: West African tales told by West Africans dramatize Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Identifying what will make July 1 celebration significant and doing it. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Europe goes *gold* with TMs in Bavaria and Schleswig-Holstein.

Internal: Impact of global passers-through grounds our globality.

Contradiction: Monitoring procedures for continued campaign push during summer. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Proposal drafted for Belgian Ministry of French Culture to fund Forum Communautaire in Wallonia in 1978-79.

Internal: Securing one summer job releases permeator and rest of House to attend summer program.

Contradiction: Using to our best advantage the preliminary channels that have opened up in order to push GCF proposal quickly through bureaucratic red tape. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: A Development trek to the far reaches of Holland (north and south) results in cash and metro colleague formulation.

Internal: Area budget projections finally in the black! The House experiments with summer evening collegiums. Greg Maxwell, RS-I grad from Salina, Kansas, bicycles through and stays for three days.

Contradiction: Discerning the concrete products of this reflective time that will enable quick fall victories. (Wk. 13)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Town Meeting documentation and follow-up puts finishing touches on the *Germany Goes Gold* maneuver.

Internal: John Oyter, Blase Sands and Inger Bartram sent out to GRA.

Contradiction: Discerning the documentation forms needed to launch fall campaigns. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: July 1st preparations marked by in-kind successes, finishing touches on *treffpunkt*, as community excitement grows with birthday party in Senioren meeting and Hannah Muraya's Kawangware report to Guild.

Internal: House welcomes Hannah Muraya from Kawangware, as collegium reports explode globality in House.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to corporately gun the July 1st event and experience authentic leadership. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Health Caretakers again impact community as they assist five nursing sisters from the mobile clinic to immunize 69 children against smallpox, measles, polio and DPT. Demonstration home garden catches on with four new ones started in Stake 5 and another in Stake 1. Women's group gains momentum as attendance increases from 16 to 36. They decide to have farming training twice a month from Kawangware's Mutoka, between sewing and cooking lessons. Preschool reopens with 134, following two weeks of teachers' training.

Internal: As *cold* winter winds make icy sheets and brisk outdoor baths, Kapini construction workers push auxiliary house-training center toward completion, as walls near roofing stage. Send out Thomas and Gibson Mwaisiye to Shantumbu to help families in harvesting.

Contradiction: Thinning auxiliary staff while facing the demand to engage mor people from the community. (Wk. 13)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 am — 12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kawangware Community Council participants fill Community Centre to overflowing, as they celebrate end of quarter and year. *Yellow Brick Road* maneuver completed, with 2 Village Meetings and 430 people in last province of Kenya, NE Province (Garissa).

Internal: Nairobi Area Council held with Order, staff and representatives from Kawangware and Kamweleni in attendance. Fantastic celebration releases dramatic portrayal of past year and claims of promise for coming year around globe.

Contradiction: Continuing incredible momentum of past week that will sustain solid decisions and release visionary action that is required. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Guilds move into action as farmer's guild plants new cooperative nursery. Industrial guild elects one manager for all industries, and the health guild sponsors a cooking class. Community celebrates first meeting in Community Center with hot chocolate and bread added to traditional foods.

Internal: The power of corporateness overshadows inconveniences felt as House moves into facility with light plastic roof and no doors or windows.

Contradiction: Instilling excitement in the community over Kamweleni Open House. (Wk. 13)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17) and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takali for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25*. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR—KENDUR HDP

External: Shramdan on bus stand tree ring involves 15 villagers in carrying Shabud Stones, inkind labor of two masons, inkind 100 cut stones and 15 rupees are raised for another 100 from local merchants; 34 people are recruited to take loans on cows and 15 recruited to raise papaya for popain.

Internal: New decor highlights the campaign of the 25. One more auxiliary becomes ICA and dons new blue shirt. Auxiliary toilet is completed with new doors attached.

Contradiction: Finding a way for villagers to come up with own resources for village needs and activities. (Wk.13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH—VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Auti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON—TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satura, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared by each of six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Manila Mandal has successful GWF in Satura and village sends two women to the Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Ranganath Yadav, M. Galkwad and S. Galkwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI—UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI—SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of *Shivni Voice* is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic look. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON—ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately launched with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary. House sends out consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI—TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON—MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Three members of Delhi House participate in Nava Gram Prayas as Vivian Paul is doing guilding work in Maliwada, Marie Paul is doing Development in Bombay, Roger is at Vaviharsh and Goethau is on six-week intensification trek. Six villagers from Maliwada come to Delhi to do research in carpet making, as arranged by Birlas.

Internal: Pre-monsoon showers bring down the temperature by several degrees and give new life and energy to the House. Marie Paul returns to begin the preschool and Global Language School.

Contradiction: Keeping the ship afloat in the midst of a raging storm. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Rope making machine ordered and first wool muffler is produced. Baby weighing highlights Health Guild Week, 1056 feet of new road completed, 18 new bulloch loans sanctioned, 10,500 cubic feet of morem is used to fill old village compost pits, eye camp examines 50 people, and application filed for electrification of Stake 1. Foundation dug for Women's Activity Center and hybrid jowar seeds distributed, with 10% of product to go to the mid-day meals program.

Internal: Jack Gilles returns with mountain of information from Maliwada, regarding the great campaign of the 25. All auxiliary move in to new House and celebrate with fine meal. Send out Balms, Dyhrs, Jack Gilles and Lance Ternasky to Project Directors' Meeting in Maliwada, with Dyhrs and Gilles to continue on to Europe.

Contradiction: Understanding project actuation in midst of radical staff turnover and keeping emerging monsoon from dictating models. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Ambas, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SURUSUP HDP

External: First consignment of Landicrafts sold; pre-school building procured and transformed. New bus stop becomes community node, and major workday clears main road as impacting entrance. Decision of pre-school parents to pay for all cost of pre-school marks significance of life and death of leading young guildsman.

Internal: Week marked by feasting with clams and crabs at overnight beach celebration with community youth. House welcomes Julie and Erica Hays back with reports from Area Planning Session.

Contradiction: Finding the implementaries that will sustain the Consult motivation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Development team hits \$7500 second week in a row.

Internal: George and Ruthe Yost arrive from Kelapa Dua as Sherwood and Eunice Shankland are sent out to GRA.

Contradiction: Finding a way to channel current surge in community into project victories. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Indonesian Government officially approves proposal for a project in South Sulawesi (BONTOA) six days after proposal was submitted. An 11-member board is formed of villagers for the credit union. Training begins for chicken industry with 13 attending. New rail (bamboo) fence is built along main road through the village. One villager and two Indonesian bridges are repaired in preparation for June 10 celebration.

Internal: James Carmichael, the man in charge of the Canadian Embassy funding programs, brings his wife and two small children to stay overnight at the Project. Soehardi's father visits for one week and helps to harvest mungbeans. Project obtains a bolt of blue cloth and everyone is making a new blue shirt for the 10 June celebration.

Contradiction: Moving the village leadership quickly so that they see that the 10 June celebration as a consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development treks in Sapporo, Tokyo and Hong Kong.

Internal: Entire Nexus participates in Nam Wai workday in preparation for Nam Wai Fair. Send out Rowe's, Tony Elizondo and Barbara Donnelly to GRA.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in midst of temptation to "wait until after Council." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Four young adults sent out to Sudtonggan for Completion celebration, one sponsored by his company Duty Free Shoppers to the tune of HK\$1200, and 35 key villagers are present for send out and celebration planning with all ages and phases represented. Meeting and sendout established commitment for our own celebration July 2, 1978.

Internal: The House shifts into second phase of the quarter with a trip to local Chinese restaurant which renews vitality in preparation of rest of quarter. Student volunteer comes back to work in project 3 days a week after the completion of her school intern commitment.

Contradiction: Speeding up the tortoise pace of private and public in relation to the pace of competition. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Newly initiated 4H Club will not be blocked and finds new location to prepare for pig raising project. Village beautification has caught on and villagers now bring new plants for all the planters and assist in the planting and care.

Internal: Weekly collegium of Chinese lessons enables more spontaneous relations with the village.

Contradiction: Learning patience while the village follows through on the tasks constantly slowed down by red tape. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Week begins with two days of imaginal teachers day care training; leadership training with every *sitio* represented is held for Community Planning Assembly which created a quarter timeline on Saturday. 150 cement hollow blocks inkinded from Steel Fabricating Company.

Internal: The House receives Tito De laSerna from Cebu and celebrates the return of Judy Albers from Manila. House sends out Geni, Leroy and Micah Philbrook to GRA Chicago. House receives Elsa Languido as a fellow.

Contradiction: Engaging a broader portion of the total community. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Prior Hickey visits a Guardian's (Dr. Aksenoff) farm over the weekend and meets the ambassador from Peru and Lord Tsugoru.

Internal: Two Lions Club members visit Tokyo House for two nights during their international convention. Bob Griffin and Jim Oberg arrive for development.

Contradiction: Recruiting ITI while threading together a fabric. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Chicken farm manager is key issue of late night meeting of Board of Directors of Village Treasury. Pre-school Health Clinic examines early education care; Kwangyung Il Bulletin begins its second year of publication; another installment is paid toward Training Center boiler.

Internal: Send out GRA participants and welcome Barry Oakley back from HDTs.

Contradiction: Turning interest and commitments into cash. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Celebrate end of quarter, 28 Community Meetings, and development of \$9740 at Chinese restaurant. Rader breaks loose new Development networks in Southern Metro.

Internal: House celebrates Jay Zahrt's 16th birthday and spends three collegiums reviewing the past quarter.

Contradiction: Discerning the numerous strategies and tactics to ensure success on all fronts. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Keeping involvement of metro active during July and August. (Wk. 1)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

Internal: House celebrates completion of Saturation Experiment with movies and hamburgers.

Contradiction: Tying up all loose ends in time to participate in Summer Program. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: One hundred people joined in the One Year Celebration on June 24, highlighted by Vogar beating ICA in baseball (13-7), arm wrestling and a pie eating contest. The dance featured jiggling contest with elders judging.

Internal: Nine colleagues from Winnipeg drive up for House Church and enable great impact and singing.

Contradiction: Transisting to second year with momentum that will win the established leadership and develop second-line leadership. (Wk. 1)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: The House journeys to Asherton, Texas during Week II to help set up for Consult. Development team reports \$4,000 per project raised by Area Houston during June.

Internal: Focus shifts from Consult recruitment to GRA recruitment. Steve Rhea returns from Jamaica Consult with glowing reports of the happening there.

Contradiction: Designing maneuvers in a time of profound unclarity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Indianoma Consult began with a tremendous Opening Feast on Sunday evening, June 24 with 300 local citizens present. The community was graced with the presence of two state Senators, the State Representative for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and leading businessmen from the county and state.

Internal: Over 100 people were present at the Closing Banquet after completing the Saturday Miracle Day. Evening celebration with barbeque and dancing concluded the Consult Week.

Contradiction: Moving ahead rapidly with designed maneuvers in the midst of overwhelming possibility on our hands. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Sixty people attend Consult prep meeting and everyone volunteers for work. All stakes are visited with miracles planned in each stake and underway in three.

Internal: Jill Rodda and Doug Rosendal are sent to San Antonio to inkind. Jay Antenen arrives. Emerging Generation structures solve troop time block.

Contradiction: Releasing public utility services for HDP house. (Wk 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Three USA 12 slide show presentations given and half of additional consultants confirmed with money. Plans for GWF are privileged with visit to Decorator Show House to plan the use of space.

Internal: House sends out Slicker Family to Indianoma HDP and celebrates new House configuration with Fiesta at Panchos.

Contradiction: Putting together the new configuration of forces to complete the myriad of tasks. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Texas Town Meeting Summary Report is inkind and distributed to 1800 people across the State. Charlotte Graham decides to do anthropology research in Indianoma. One hundred thank you letters are sent to *inkind contributors* for Texas TM.

Internal: Metro and House collate 2,000 TM: Texas Reports, topped off with a midnight enchilada dinner.

Contradiction: Recruiting for GRA '78 when all efforts have been placed on nearby consults. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Seventy-four youth and adult counselors from churches in Indiana and Texas joined the Pace Youth Service Corps in the *Week of Miracles*. Major transformations happened, a few of which are 13 houses painted, hedges renewed, and residents' name signs up. Completed restaurant patio and dining area while the laundromat is renovated and awaits new machines. Two thousand inkind Comprehensive Plan Brochures arrive.

Internal: Guests Laura Ennis, Mark Porter and Carole Payne join the Youth Work Camp for the week. Week II was a time of celebration with swimming and shish-ka-bobs.

Contradiction: Inventing the plan that will continue the large numbers of community participation and complete the work begun during the Youth Work Camp. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Region is represented by three colleagues at Asherton Consult, who bring home reports of victorious in-kind maneuvers, enthusiastic community involvement, and tremendous growth potential.

Internal: An almost empty House becomes wayside inn for a Guardian's son from Boston, a Korean minister trekking around USA, and a Pace couple on discontinuity.

Contradiction: Creating the symbols and rituals that will daily pronounce the Word, when there is no other person to pronounce it. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Alabama is yellow! Troops move from Montgomery across North America to back-up consults. Memphis House receives official red, white and blue document of Resolution 119—House of Representatives endorsement of Town Meeting: Tennessee. Black TMs are real events. Ripley, Tennessee Town Meeting tackles racism issue and stormy meeting ends with blacks and whites exchanging phone numbers with plans to meet again for potluck dinner and planning. Internal: Compilation of data for Tennessee is a

long process because House repeatedly sings the songs, rereads the stories and proposals. House welcomes back McCabe and sends him out with Kelley Michael to Asherton consult, sends Kathy Addington out for summer and Pat Goad to Indianoma consult. Carol Poole sent to Cincinnati after quickie garage sale unloads junk for \$110 self-support.

Contradiction: Developing rhythm necessary to sustain slim troops to complete the tasks. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Five Georgian colleagues serve as consultants to the Gibson HDP. In-kindling effort nets 125 pounds of peanut butter and five cases of pickles.

Internal: Assignment of all troops to locations outside of Atlanta.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the Movement not involved first-hand in the Gibson Project. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: First task force meeting on Tuesday has 35 persons present. Surveys are begun with excited local participation. Transformation of inkind teacherage for staff housing pulls in more volunteers. Unsolicited \$300 check is received in the mail from a major businessman's memorial fund for the first local Development sign.

Internal: Truckloads arrive from the Charlotte House to open the new Charlotte House—Gibson HDP. Living in a trailer gives new images of corporate and private space. House Church is held in training center (old school where Project office is housed), and 22 people appear at the send out of the Bingham family of five to the Jamaican Consult. Redfield's appear as ready and willing colleagues formerly involved in Philadelphia.

Contradiction: Engaging community in corporate maneuvers to prepare for the Consult in two weeks. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Xerox prints Florida Summary Report free and United Telephone sends grant of \$300.

Internal: Church gives two weeks paid so staff can go to Gibson Consult.

Contradiction: Knowing what to do and doing it now to be ready for late August. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: People continue to arrive for the GRA including representatives from Iowa churches that have adopted villages and aborigines from Murrin Bridge.

Internal: Chicago Nexus program support forces participate part time in GRA task forces and attend dinner, allowing them to hear Assembly talks.

Contradiction: Maintaining ongoing programs while the GRA is in session. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Saheed (Chicago Economic Development Organization) goes to Mill Shoals on behalf of the industry work. Three new mini-zones are approved by the City of Chicago.

Internal: The House receives summer preparations as new kitchen door is put up.

Contradiction: Remembering the GRA is the Movement's first priority, while secondary items are handled. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Letters from towns in response to the question, "What happened after your town meeting?" report that newsletters, grant requests, cleanup days, more town meetings, joining the PRIDE (state community development program), and plans for a festival are in the works.

Internal: Office decor updated with document covers from each Kansas Town Meeting and six-color timeline.

Contradiction: Waiting until the Summer Program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Local history night generates enthusiasm for Project. Des Moines Register, Iowa's only state-wide newspaper, spends full day taking pictures and talking to people for a "before" story. They will also cover the Consult and follow up on the Project. VISTA contracts arrive for signature.

Internal: John McAdam, Karen Kivimaki and Asher Ertel arrive to bring auxiliary to full strength. Regional work weekend with 20 colleagues transform hotel into residences and offices.

Contradiction: Preparing 800 people for the coming journey into the new world. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Lorimor Human Development Consult has everyone turned on and going full steam—metro colleagues to put finishing touches on auxiliary accommodations.

Internal: House and Metro celebrate the cluster's school year's end with dinner at Stevenson's Apple Farm.

Contradiction: Maintaining self-support push while sustaining Lorimor Consult dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: As fourth LENS Course ends for the Department of Natural Resources, the largest state department and the third largest landowner in the U.S., 150 staff will have participated in four such courses, for the purpose of learning how to use citizen participation as part of the Department's work and planning.

Internal: House hears report on the four LENS courses from veteran Loudermilk and reflects on the deep necessity to use LENS and other tools to include the established structures around the upcoming HDP town of Kinney, in the creation of the project so that in two years the town will have established the new links with the world that will enable it to continue.

Contradiction: Creating and using the imaginal charts and working decor which hold the accountability and urgency of the task at hand. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: GWF at Babler State Park with 34 women around the table representing St. Louis, East St. Louis, Springfield, Illinois, Kansas City, Missouri and Mill Shoals, Illinois, was a significant bi-state event as all phases were present and strong possibilities for future engagement of women were evident.

Internal: Wrap-up of the GWF day with returning tables to the church, visiting Souard Market for donations of produce for HDP Consult, returning the borrowed truck, and inking celebration supper and largest mug of beer ever seen, reveals "the wonder of total engagement."

Contradiction: Enabling Mill Shoals HDP. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA-MILL SHOALS HDP

External: In the midst of the completion of the document, auxiliary and global consult team celebrate the next two years in Mill Shoals with a backyard barbeque.

Internal: Elders' bus trip to Carmi for lunch and to see nutrition center in operation points toward a similar lunch program here this quarter

Contradiction: Creating forms of motivity for the long march projects. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Kinney HDP moves into high gear as second newsletter comes out; 20 show up for pre-stake meeting, and first workday has people out working in every stake before auxiliary arrive.

Internal: Town Councilman's family invites auxiliary out on their boat after workday; waterskiing behind 150 hp engine is new experience of contingency.

Contradiction: Getting the rest of Kinney out of their living rooms. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDP's along the way.

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDP's right here at home. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The House and metro celebrate and participate in US 12 by sending consultants, enablement forces, a patron and actuation forces to Mill Shoals HDP. Two GWF and six Town Meetings are set up for next fall.

Internal: House hosts David and Jackie Speicher's parents and spins tales of US 12 and TM: Indiana. Breakfast out to celebrate the very last county going *gold*, and the rest of us take off for Mill Shoals and GRA.

Contradiction: Standing before both the 100 open doors in Indiana and the global wisdom of GRA '78. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Great Kentucky Cotillion is finished in grand style—all 120 counties are GOLDEN.

Internal: Cotillion celebration with colleagues, with sendout of Jim Armour to the Widen Consult and Shirley St. John to the Alabama Campaign.

Contradiction: Gathering all loose ends in order to focus on the summer. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Held training event for Town Meetings in urban saturation community, involving Michigan Bell community relations staff as volunteer workshop leaders; set up Town Meeting in Michigan's last county for June 8; hosted GWF, CYF, and LENS teams to set up forums as part of saturation.

Internal: Colleague Lois Martin brings acquaintance Gayle Thompson to house, who is interested in doing something with her life. Made call to London to ask to spend at least a year in HDP there or Wales.

Contradiction: Playing the trump we have. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The East End Neighborhood House Training Meeting is highly successful in weaning new Town Meeting grads from ICA leadership to newly awakened community leadership.

Internal: The House installs a revolving door and sends out Lois Reeves and colleague Mike Tippett to Brazil Consult and receives Chris Copley, Mary Poole and Genevieve Morrill on stopoffs along with Jane Booher and Addie Batica on Development.

Contradiction: Maintaining steady beat in midst of summer comings and goings. (Wk. 1)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The final week of GRA recruitment nets eleven people going to the GRA and raises \$700 for scholarship funding.

Internal: House welcomes Rod Worden returning from Latin American and receives a fine report on Woburn Lawn. The main thrust this week was the publication of our learnings in the arenas of corporate life and area corporateness.

Contradiction: Rendering up the old year with a story of the meaning of the new one. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Metro colleague visits and participates in summer recruitment workshop.

Internal: Collegiums and conversations relative to GRA and next year begin to help us design the future.

Contradiction: Creating a unified summer maneuver that separates necessary things that need to be done from the forever ambiguous. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Push on inkind for HDP while completing invitations for HDP consult recruitment.

Internal: Alice Rose qualifies for city track, and having the Youth Cluster Evaluation completed creates a great impact on the House.

Contradiction: Consults coming up fast, and we are only at the starting gate. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Two more Town Meetings are set for Isle of Wight county saturation.

Internal: House celebrates with Ivy City at House Church.

Contradiction: Quickly firming up commitments that have been made and expanding the GSF base. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON—IVY CITY HDP

External: Do-ment festival, *Ivy City: A Showcase for Progress*, powerfully symbolizes the shift from Phase I to Phase II, as well as a new partnership between the four US Showpieces.

Internal: Thursday night celebration radically dramatizes the collegiality of the four US Showpieces and global development.

Contradiction: Defining the Project maneuvers that will inform the tactics for the summer and next year, relative to focusing image. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Seventeen attend stake meetings, where conversation is about store, fire department, health service, and youth activities. Meetings are set to deal with these. Three youth and one adult are sent to enable Gibson HDP Consult.

External: Three major mailings go out this week: a regional newsletter, a mailing about the GRA, following up phoning, and packets to each of the Houses in the area.

Internal: Pedagogy continued this week with great lecture on corporate priorship and breakloose study of community paper.

Contradiction: Naming the eventfulness of the summer. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Banner goes up on Chicken Street announcing 4th of July celebration; workday transforms the town green in preparation — complete with grids on freshly painted trash barrels, barbeque pits and decored bulletin board. The celebration is a great success with unique parade, fiddling and singing and hayride. The first 4th in Starks in 68 years was a whopper!

Internal: Three Houses and Development Centrum represented in Regional Workshop after hearing exciting report from Ann Duffy on GRA.

Contradiction: Meshing the community's vision for the future of Starks with a broader on-behalf-of vision. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Thursday evening Campaign Night, began as a housewarming event is now a weekly dynamic which continues to bring old colleagues and new neighbors together for reflection and acquainting ourselves with the neighborhood.

Internal: House travels to Starks to participate in Regional Project Meeting and 4th of July celebration, and discover ourselves grateful for corporate collegial reflection..

Contradiction: Establishing and maintaining regular communication with colleagues and contributors throughout the metro. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Phase II planning session with seven local participants identifies seven arenas of activities, and results in decision to operate in task forces.

Internal: Museum trip and picnic celebrates work weekend with Philadelphia House and Rochester colleagues.

Contradiction: Shifting focus of activity from immediacies to long-range, solid implementation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House sees double as it focuses simultaneously on enabling Starks HDP and "Windham Whammo" County Saturation in Connecticut with five Town Meetings this week. Consultants, enablers, and visitors are sent off to Starks Consult at evening slide show and briefing.

Internal: Campaign Night activities consist of metro colleagues taking full responsibility for orchestrating the Killingly, Ct. Town Meeting.

Contradiction: Attaining use of wheels to take in-kind materials and people to the Starks Consult. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House works on Area and National reports to take to the summer, producing first draft of Canadian CFC Brochure and the National Proposal Chart (with 72 proposals).

Internal: House participates in Quebec's Fete National St. Jean Baptistes on 24th of June with singing and dancing in the streets of Old Montreal, bonfires, and fireworks, concerts and music. Six youth attend ecclesiola while Wilbur Leatherman brings global greetings from Delta Pace and TM: USA on his way to the Coady International Institute in Nova Scotia.

Contradiction: Maintaining the urgent missional thrust, amidst diverse assignments and approaching summer program. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of house is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: With self-support being a major unresolved issue, a Week II PSU on consulting services was held and a mailer was created with the objective of \$50,000 in fees for 78-79.

Internal: The Hai Ou song with a melody that haunts us with the East permeates our week as we deliberate on next year's global and area objectives.

Contradiction: Clarifying practical contradictions in order to understand the overall maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Newly formed task team beginning work on New Day Canada Assembly for fall, symbolized the victory in hand relative to 12 visible miracles in process for June 30 global celebration.

Internal: Intensification of Project symbolized by the arrival and departure of troops. Creation of a guardian of the symbolic for each week and completing plans for the task forces for the summer.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between optimizing accomplishments for the summer and giving attention to leadership training and formation. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Long-awaited week of CHA, Cano Negro Hacia Adelante, arrives including scavenger hunt, parades, Community Assembly, workdays and Health Agricultural Fair in which seven agencies participate. Inkind nets new Gestetner, refrigerator, 500 reams of paper, kitchen supplies and whole cow for HDTS. Faculty works on HDTS adaptation. Foro Comunitario in Maracaibo for Rotary youth is a great success.

Internal: Staff sends out Paul Calhoun to the Academy and celebrates with village the ending of the week of CHA.

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTS and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Consult launches HDP demonstrating the possibility of one-week Consult set up. HDTS grads operate as catalytic core during preparation and launch week. The majority of the adult population participates in the nightly team work. Implementation begins with construction and painting of Community Center, including initial landscaping and drainage system work. A youth group is organized and presents a cultural show — the first in the history of the village.

Internal: Celebrate completion of first week of Consult with dinner for 40 in a festive dance hall in Lampa. Celebrate anniversary of marriages of Crockers and Packards and anniversary of ordination of Rafael Davila. Document production and translation begins simultaneously. Begin to forge the style of the Auxiliary.

Contradiction: Turning all necessary *do's* into focused strategies. (Wk. 2)

The contradiction is in the arena of moving to the next level of momentum in the HDPs, after the fairs.

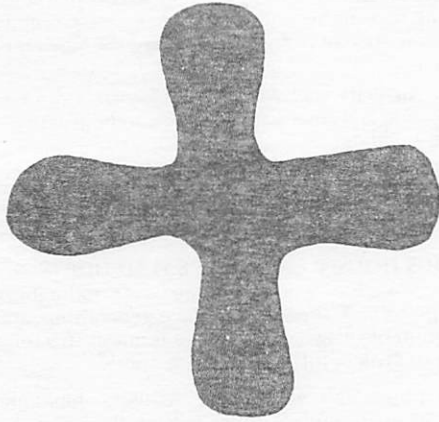

Internal: House gets a taste of the rural as water supply is cut off for a week and has to be collected daily in buckets from mobile water truck.

Contradiction: Doing *everything* in midst of fragmentation and lack of communication as troops scatter to Council, TM circuits and Project Annex. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Area Teams cover region by train and car, putting two more stronghold families in place to enable fall acceleration, holding one TM in Corrie Common and setting one up for next week; Development writes foundation proposal for Tai'rgwaith community store and brings back pledges from metro circuit visits..

Internal: House journeys to London for Area strategy, then to Tai'rgwaith for Cunningham-Dempster congregational dinner; House shares United Kingdom miracle stories and GRA Opening Address with key Glasgow colleagues over candlelight dinner.

Contradiction: Learning to manipulate the short sword of immediate TMs and the long sword of network catalyzation for next phase. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Carnival Day, despite heavy rain and cold, was a crowd gatherer, including local M.P., leader of Borough Administration, county surveyor, county engineer and local borough councillor — this was the culmination of Carnival Week which was kicked off by the *Best Dressed Street* competition, children's bike contest, youth cabaret and other community events in the Parish Hall.

Internal: After Carnival celebration highlighted with visit of local dignitaries to House; male auxiliary visit coal-face 1800 feet underground at nearby colliery and find selves impressed by modern mining technology.

External: *Three Ring Circus Operation* underway: two Town Meetings held in Scotland, with another set up, while three cars inkinded.

Internal: Extra troops join operation in the form of Mary Murphy, Chris Boivan, Lea Dunbar and Lucille Tessier. Lea Dunbar stops at Manchester and updates Fr. Whelan on India before joining the Scottish Patrol.

Contradiction: Finding the consensus while still in experimental state of quick set-up and event of Town Meeting campaign. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Italy is *Gold!* The last of 18 regions has its *Riunione Cittadina* (Town Meeting). More than 500 Italians have participated. Ten young bilingual Italians joined a two-week task force to set up and lead RCs across the whole nation. Meanwhile Termine HDP gears up for June 30 with 100 invitations put in the mail. Spanish priest returns from Academy overjoyed.

Internal: Grand celebration in Rome as all treks return victorious. Reflection, dinner and dancing prepare for sendout of Continental Task Force to Belgium, France and England. Two Italians pack for Isle of Dogs, one for Chicago and a Terinese for Kreuzberg.

Contradiction: Enabling long march engagement and movement building in the midst of all the awakenment flurry. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Community organizes work day of Town Hall renovation.

Internal: New Week II time design which includes Ecclesiola gives entire house more ways to corporately context ourselves and still get tasks accomplished.

Contradiction: Creating one thrust in the midst of many activities. (Wk. 4)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the future and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Qtr.III Dorpsdag (Community Forum) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

2 RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House attends graduation party of medical student colleague, where he and parents disclose plans to do extended stays in an HDP.

Internal: House sends out Martha Lapka to Global Priors Council, while continuing to host global colleagues passing through.

Contradiction: Being present to the next day's and week's opportunities for colleague engagement and maneuver groundwork over a summer of great dispersal. (Wk. 4)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: House participates in Kreuzberg Ost yearly evaluation and planning and is extremely impressed by the participation and enthusiasm of the Kreuzbergers and their astute picture of what has been accomplished in these two years.

Internal: House is down to one adult and two emerging generation; updated mailing list and straightened-out office are fantastic accomplishments after months of being on the road.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum while juggling practical tasks involved in running House alone. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: July 1st Celebration hosts community in *treffpunkt* open house, complete with Kawangware slide show, 24 Project display, Senioren coffee and cake sale in backyard "garden cafe", and pictorial history of project. Evening celebration hosts over 200 guests at barbeque with address by Mayor of Kreuzberg, presentation of gifts from Kawangware and Termine, followed by music and dancing.

Internal: Arrival of Ruthild and Michael, and subsequent send out of Michael and Gottfried to GRA.

Future planning that focuses energy and maintains momentum in midst of summer movement of troops. (Wk. 4)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

500 attend grand celebration to welcome home Mr. Lengalenga from Kawangware & Kamwaleni HDP visits, view HDP slide show and send out Farrars to Chicago. Visitors from Standard Bank and Northland Engineering express surprise at all that's going on in Kapini. Two trucks arrive on site with maize mill shed materials from Colgate-Palmolive as foundation is being laid. Site cleared for block factory transfer. Roofing going on the 16-room training centre. Kapini hosts Commonwealth Community Developers from 14 Nations who join in Friday Workday activities and singing at Guild lunch. Ten farm trainees now wearing green uniforms and receiving daily training. Government landrover arrives by surprise during Housechurch to collect mid-wives for their second week long training session in Kabwe. Kapini Green Warriors demonstrate style of winmanship against the Ngwerere Police in 1-1 tie.

Internal: Auxiliary staff welcomes Sukumar, from University of Zambia and Sri Lanka, who has come to help with roads and bridge re-building.

Contradiction: With auxiliary troops scattered in all directions, meeting dead lines for 2 major events. (Wk. 4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 am — 12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Bulk buying takes off in Kawangware with enthusiastic participation by community businessmen and East Africa Industries; visit from USAID NGO evaluation team finds Kawangware rates high in involvement and dedication, low in statistical and financial aptitude; visit by Price Waterhouse, auditors, gives advice on proper setting of books; area post moves Volvo office as Development maneuver.

Internal: Mr. Lenga Lenga does collegium on the Kapini HDP, impacting the House with the fact that all programs are being done by volunteers who receive no bursaries.

Contradiction: Bridging the Order training gap in the arena of financial management. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Community decides on continuous workdays to meet Canadian building timeline; cement donated by local shop owners and Chief's Baraza.

Internal: Mr. Lenga Lenga from Kapini visits; Augustine Hajega completes travel preparations for Global Council.

Contradiction: Finding the way to dramatize the appropriate urgency. (Wk. 4)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the replication school and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavail.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25* (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR—KENDUR HDP

External: Shramdan on bus stand tree ring involves 15 villagers in carrying Shabud Stones, inkind labor of two masons, inkind 100 cut stones and 15 rupees are raised for another 100 from local merchants; 34 people are recruited to take loans on cows and 15 recruited to raise papaya for papain.

Internal: New decor highlights the campaign of the 25. One more auxiliary becomes ICA and dons new blue shirt. Auxiliary toilet is completed with new doors attached.

Contradiction: Finding a way for villagers to come up with own resources for village needs and activities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH—VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Auti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON—TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satura, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared by each of six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Manila Mandal has successful GWF in Satura and village sends two women to the Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up. Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Ranganath Yadav, M. Galkwad and S. Galkwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI—UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI—SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of *Shivni Voice* is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON—ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately launched with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary. House sends out consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI—TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON—MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Three members of Delhi House participate in Nava Gram Prayas as Vivian Paul is doing guilding work in Maliwada, Marie Paul is doing Development in Bombay, Roger is at Vaviharsh and Goethau is on six-week intensification trek. Six villagers from Maliwada come to Delhi to do research in carpet making, as arranged by Birlas.

Internal: Pre-monsoon showers bring down the temperature by several degrees and give new life and energy to the House. Marie Paul returns to begin the preschool and Global Language School.

Contradiction: Keeping the ship afloat in the midst of a raging storm. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Rope making machine ordered and first wool muffler is produced. Baby weighing highlights Health Guild Week, 1056 feet of new road completed, 18 new bulloch loans sanctioned, 10,500 cubic feet of morem is used to fill old village compost pits, eye camp examines 50 people, and application filed for electrification of Stake 1. Foundation dug for Women's Activity Center and hybrid jowar seeds distributed, with 10% of product to go to the mid-day meals program.

Internal: Jack Gilles returns with mountain of information from Maliwada, regarding the great campaign of the 25. All auxiliary move in to new House and celebrate with fine meal. Send out Balms, Dyhrs, Jack Gilles and Lance Ternasky to Project Directors' Meeting in Maliwada, with Dyhrs and Gilles to continue on to Europe.

Contradiction: Understanding project actuation in midst of radical staff turnover and keeping emerging monsoon from dictating models. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Ambas, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SERUSUP HDP

External: Borrowed tiller plowing 20 home gardens in two days precipitates guild meeting and decision to purchase a tiller corporately; nutrition survey indicates all vegetables bought 30 minutes away, with 57% of the children (1-5) suffering mild to severe malnutrition; visibility push continues with two more bus stops finished, goal posts for soccerfield rebuilt and grand Malaysian style entrance arch begun.

Internal: Addition of one new local sojourner and first weekly maneuver writing session puts even more excitement into new quarter.

Contradiction: Engaging many other people who are unemployed and unoccupied in effective activities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Economic Advisors to Prime Minister visit Project and reveal that Sungai Lui is one of four "pioneering" development projects in Malaysia under observation and evaluation for their contribution to the future direction of development policies in the nation.

Internal: Two new Malaysian interns join the Sungai Lui auxiliary.

Contradiction: Moving from the assembly area to the front lines as one force. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: MCK Stake 1 and pumps almost finished; new vegetables are planted in the garden; materials for new chicken house are prepared; guests are welcomed from Singer and village celebrates wedding.

Internal: House welcomes Kathleen Rees from Australia and two guests from Singapore, and sends out Scott to Medan.

Contradiction: How to keep leadership and programs going in the midst of many celebrations. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House joins with Nam Wai auxiliary in *Open Day* celebration; *One Day Wonder* Development in Hong Kong nets \$2000 (US).

Internal: Oberg returns from Tokyo trek; Nexus hosts Joanne Slicker enroute from Maliwada to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Maintaining finger on pulse of activity in zone in midst of pulling together year-end reports. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Four young adults sent out to Sudtonggan for Completion celebration, one sponsored by his company Duty Free Shoppers to the tune of HK\$1200, and 35 key villagers are present for send out and celebration planning with all ages and phases represented. Meeting and sendout established commitment for our own celebration July 2, 1978.

Internal: The House shifts into second phase of the quarter with a trip to local Chinese restaurant which renews vitality in preparation of rest of quarter. Student volunteer comes back to work in project 3 days a week after the completion of her school intern commitment.

Contradiction: Speeding up the tortoise pace of private and public in relation to the pace of competition. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Newly initiated 4H Club will not be blocked and finds new location to prepare for pig raising project. Village beautification has caught on and villagers now bring new plants for all the planters and assist in the planting and care.

Internal: Weekly collegium of Chinese lessons enables more spontaneous relations with the village.

Contradiction: Learning patience while the village follows through on the tasks constantly slowed down by red tape. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: S.C. Johnson donates \$3,000 and 5 other companies donate \$700. Inkind playground equipment from Goodyear and pre-school uniform material from Ramie Textiles is shipped free to Davao for the Langub HDP.

Internal: Dr. Roger Williams from Canberra visits on way back from Surusup consult and decides to visit Sudtonggan. Faithful remnant of three engage in house management and self-support with 10 new English students, bringing projected income to \$1,000 per month.

Contradiction: Holding the symbolic life of the Order when self-support necessitates 2 people leaving the house at 6:45 A.M. and returning at 9:00 P.M. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Published models for Hai Ou villagers' Philippine trip, including budget and task/itinerary chart; four people from Taiwan planning to attend Hokkaido ITI.

Internal: Metro colleagues join House in celebrating USA Independence Day; Joanne Slicker reports on India.

Contradiction: Locating new facility for the House which holds the relevant values. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Rock and craft orders surge to an all-time high; village painting sees 20 houses painted brilliant colors, with the 130 remaining houses to be finished soon; guild meeting draws largest turnout ever with 180 people (20% of population).

Internal: Fourth of July, Filipino-US Friendship Day and Sandra Blaik's birthday are celebrated on a Virgin Island in the Cebu Channel; water pump motor now runs like a Rolls-Royce thanks to a skillfully overhaul by Lester and Andy.

Contradiction: Struggling to find a contradiction in this paradise. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Barangay site and playground bulldozed; craft training on-going and sewing training completed with seamstresses sewing Day Care uniforms; Bureau of Soil Director and staff visit to plan contour farming; charcoal bodega under construction; health clinic set up.

Internal: Monday night fever with bonfire and Saturday night swimming.

Contradiction: Coordinating involvement so that all are engaged. (Wk. 4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: \$1,000 received from Burroughs Co., one more ITI registration; 12,000 gift bus used for the first time.

Internal: House sends Martha Denny to GRA and Council and celebrates Hickey's 40th birthday.

Contradiction: Planning for quarter with little sense of future directions for Tokyo. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Villagers given agricultural lecture by Professor Hur, who is a guardian; primary school teachers training held for observation class; chicken farm gets cleaned out.

Internal: House starts global language class with sojourners; entire House enjoys big celebration at Gwak Jir beach.

Contradiction: Managing trading post without trained person. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult Document in Korean is given to printer, and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

Contradiction: Fighting five crucial battles on widely scattered terrain with one platoon. (Wk. 2)

Internal: House steps out to do a little gridding of new area and plays guest as landlord invites all to top of roof barbecue with his family.

Contradiction: Finding time for necessary minutiae. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Visit with head of women's groups in Kobe (100,000 members) sets up GWF for group leaders November 20th.

Internal: Joanne Slicker visits on way to States, bringing exciting stories from India, and inaugurates one more room in new 16-room, rent-free facility, as House sends to Order account \$8,261 deposit refund from previous facility and settles in, with chaos enough under control to allow invitation to E.G. from other Japan Houses for summer program.

Contradiction: Determining the ways that internal victories release breaklooses in the external missio. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Faculty recruited for Summer Program as plans pull together. Details worked out for 2 English Camps the last week in July will help finances for August. Joseph Iida arrives from Tokyo to work out practics for Rikkyo University Work Camp the end of August. Inkind shipment from Lion Soap Co. Town Meeting circuits and August maneuver gets planned.

Internal: A week of arrivals: Hiroshi Fukuyama arrives from Tokyo to be on ICA staff; Molly Shaw's parents from Oregon, the Prines arrive for a week's visit. Palamon and Voaita Talackan arrive from Majuro for project visit and August program. Eija Karikoski departs for Tokyo then Finland for summer. SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Television station asks Senator Bill Withers to stage F is challenge to debate the progress of OHDP on their news program. Responsibility for MHDP task forces picked up by Sydney Metro colleagues. Development finishes week with \$1150 USD.

Internal: Guest rooms cleaned and furniture shuffled. Finally welcome Margaret Oakley back from Oombulurri HDTs, etc. Day II readings from "Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance" spin House into reflection on the New Reality. Send out GRA participants and welcome Barry Oakley back from HDTs.

Major transformations happen, a few of which are 13 houses planted, hedges renewed, and residents' name signs up. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA-MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Beautification continues as the first barn is dismantled and is in Chicago for market, employing youth for the summer; eight trash cans are painted with red and white grid and *Mill Shoals — A Great Place to be Alive!*

Internal: House celebrates arrival of Bev and Shamus Enright with hamburger cookout; \$400 of supplies for House are inkinded.

Contradiction: Laying groundwork in community programs with auxiliary at Priors Council. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Two Stark's residents return from GRA full of excitement and enthusiasm for on-going programs.

Internal: Thirty-five children bussed to nearby satellite center as part of six-week recreation program; community takes part in collating 2500 Consult Documents (1700 pounds of paper).

Contradiction: Developing and sustaining community people in leadership and involvement roles. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Weekly "Campaign Night" continues to re-engage colleagues, and enable effective reflection on vocation and the new year's missional priorities.

Internal: House celebrates the week and the new quarter by seeing a movie Saturday night.

Contradiction: Planning for the fall while facing pre-Council ambiguity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER — CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Community newsletter staff travel to nearby towns to tell the Charlottesville story and return with six paid ads.

Internal: Continental tem visits Project and strategizes with auxiliary on methods to deepen and expand the local advocacy base.

Contradiction: Rapidly initiating advocacy expansion. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: GSF celebrates a great 4th of July with Starks and decides to meet twice more during the summer to get out newsletters and marketing letters for fall impact courses.

Internal: Inspired by HDP, Boston holds Beautification Day to clear backyard, pull weeds in the mini-park next door, and polish the House plaque.

Contradiction: Creating realistic strategy for saturation in '78-'79. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Final round-up and send-out of House and colleagues to summer program; two left in the House prepare research data for the Assembly.

Internal: Wedding of Stannard and Francis impacts Order and colleagues as four from Region Montreal travel to Lorne; community wedding is a fine signal event of June 30th completion celebration.

Contradiction: Brooding effectively over missional thrusts for next year while one step removed from Summer Research Assembly. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of house is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Visits to three senators this week, including Senator Molson.

Internal: Rev. David Bugler comes to help put consultations task force on the road; closing celebration of year sends out youth to camp, farm and Chicago, leaving remnant to proceed with details of moving into summer program configurations.

Contradiction: Holding futuristic vision for House in midst of everything seeming to draw to a close. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Summer maneuver, *Gait of Power*, gets underway with signs and portents of the powerful summer to come—Lornecraft expands as the cabinet-making students work through details of their new business, rugs are sent to GRA, first strawberry crop is sold, and the Lorne Economic Development Corporation prepares to issue shares to the community.

Internal: House begins study of *Journey to Ixtlan* during ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Holding the momentum and keeping to the timeline while creating the actuating structures. (Wk. 4)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Long-awaited week of CHA, Cano Negro Hacia Adelante, arrives including scavenger hunt, parades, Community Assembly, workdays and Health Agricultural Fair in which seven agencies participate. Inkind nets new Gestetner, refrigerator, 500 reams of paper, kitchen supplies and whole cow for HDTs. Faculty works on HDTs adaptation. Foro Comunitario in Maracaibo for Rotary youth is a great success.

Internal: Staff sends out Paul Calhoun to the Academy and celebrates with village the ending of the week of CHA.

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTs and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Pre-school uniforms are sewn by women in the Industry Guild; teaching training is begun with eleven community women; Agriculture Guild meets with potential buyer of new crops; Community Structures Guild digs drainage ditches to create miracle sign.

Internal: House creates send-out celebration for Alejandro Reyes and Keith Packard as they leave for Priors Council.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity on maneuvers needed to raise up and sustain guild leaders. (Wk. 4)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; pre-school with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Human Development Project goes visible as 75 people turn out for a work day on Monday on the village square, brushing 500 feet of roadside banks, building retaining walls, flower beds and gigantic welcome sign, chopping and removing 16 fallen logs; lunch in-kind, prepared, and served to all; first copies of Consult Document roll off the JAMAL Press, resplendent in yellow covers with green and black printing (National Colors).

Internal: Troops abound, as Bingham return from family heritage trek, receive Anthony Braithwaite of Woburn Lawn as new auxiliary; Teresa is sent out to the GRA; lumber arrives to build collegium tables, while Kingston House Maneuver creates space, time and forces designs for expended living.

Contradiction: Securing the materials and finances to do all the tactics while going ahead and launching programs on all fronts with what we have. (Wk. 4)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is transformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAMP NAVA GRAM PRAYAS

External: Villages impacted by Indian circus, complete with pony rides; on Friday the villages' rabbit population increased two-fold, from five to twelve.

Internal: Villages send out fifth graders to impact the urban in Fort Wayne, while the villages saw *Man of LaMancha*, and elected officials for many of the local offices.

Contradiction: Attempting to experience the depths, while participating in life as a three-ring circus. (Wk. 4)

WEEK FOUR

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Brussels reports that nurturing of women's groups in Berlin yields 500-DM contribution from one women. Milan corporation networks show interest in funding Provincial Campaign in Italy. The year end recapitulation shows that over \$200,000 has been raised in Hong Kong, with Area Hong Kong more than doubling its developed income for the year. Hong Kong reports that intensified results in Development came about through the priority which the Area Councils gave the task. The contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining local initiative and finding ways for development troops to act as a team in the midst of areal dispersion.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Priors Council in Chicago continues the task of reflection on the insights and learnings of the past year. Council names the victories in Global Social Demonstration and Global Community Forum. Hong Kong reports that "doing it" is the key to breaking the image of "it can't be done here." The contradiction is in the arena of allowing front line data to be seen as "victories" and becoming part of the global momentum for the year ahead.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Brussels sends continental troops to the United Kingdom counties campaign, filling out its three-ring circus for next month. Tracking map of the UK Campaign is prepared as a symbol and monitoring tool. Hong Kong reports that young adults from permeator's English class participate in Nam Wai workdays and "Open Day" celebration. Breakthroughs occur in the arena of acting out of the stance that every human being is a potential troop, with invitation and engagement the key to actuating that potential. The contradiction is in the arena of relating the edge of the New Reality to everyday tasks involving us.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Brussels celebrates the release of 550,000-BF (\$17,000) in matching funds for use for Maharashtra. A fourth India visa is secured to return American staff to India. Hong Kong creates Cash Voucher forms that serve both as a check request form and a specific individual logging of expenditures by the recipient receiving the check. Petty cash back up receipts for the Hong Kong ICA books are organized for the first time in six months. The contradiction is maintaining cash flow and all management systems until the return of troops from the summer program.
