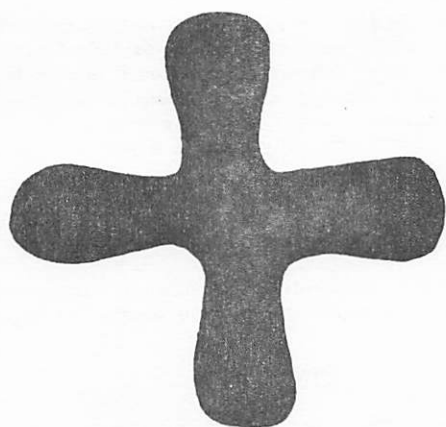

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP
External: Isle of Dogs T-shirts are donated by Texaco. Ghanan is hired as Powerhouse accountant. The lease is signed for small business building. Robin Hood Gank, Newcastle Youth Group, donates \$500 for Indian villages. The Bridge House rain forest is transformed into a tea garden.

Internal: Model is built for six-week Project countdown to end of the year. Development team is sent to Newcastle. Dieter Schmitberger is sent out after a month in the United Kingdom.

Contradiction: Building the battleplan for the last five weeks of the Year of the U.K. that makes it a finale not a fizzle. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW
External: Development calls have landed third major endorsement letter from Confederation of British Industry; Metro Circuits take decor gifts to colleagues; and talks are held with Community Education departments of two regions to set up fall TM campaign.

Internal: Football Fever overwhelms Glasgow as Scotland's soccer team prepares for Argentina World Cup Matches. Martha visits Tai'rgwaith for weekend of participation and planning while, colleague family spends Sunday evening with House and brings pledge for the year.

Contradiction: Learning how to maneuver to gain swift advantages within Scottish networks to move to next phase of the campaigns. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAIRGWAITH HDP
External: Visits by Development Centrum for a 'tour' of the project along with others such as the Probation Officer for the County continue to be most supportive and willing to plug in where needed. County delivers the wood and other supplies needed for the repair of the bus shelter.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER
External: Operation Strongbow has left its mark on the villages of the north. Skelmanthorpe, Skleton and Bearpark are communities of between two and 3,000 and had an average attendance of 45-50. The Kibblesworth date is firmly set for May 22nd.

Internal: Feet and stomachs relined as Janet Taylor sojourns and gives granny care in the form of scones, short bread and four new EG pairs of pumps.

Contradiction: Finding long term solutions to everyday mundane issues that are continually met in the immediacy of the moment. (Wk. 8)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS
External: Forum Communautaires in two more regions: langue doc and Midi Pyrenees. Colleague Françoise Demeure journeys to Belgium to do Forum Communautaire circuit there.

Internal: Domonique is assigned to Belgium to do CYF. House celebrates ninth birthday of Andrew Parker, who becomes our youngest translator, as he translates the newsletter from English to French.

Contradiction: Discovering spirit methods which sustain all in midst of dispersion. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP
External: Tuesday night meeting concerning distribution of two truck loads of inkind lumber draws out new faces and provides a catalyst for leadership. Over \$300 of

inkind goods has Terminesi asking to go out. Farmers proudly pose for pictures in front of new signs they erected on experimental plots.

Internal: Woodburys receive cake and wine breakfast, gifts and Week 11 assignment to take second honeymoon on their 21st wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Moving Terminesi to leadership that can see the victories they are actually accomplishing now. (Wk. 9)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Blitz on poles gets 16 more planted and headtailor meetw with bed sheet distributor. Trustee requests TM in his town and fifth new development contacts are uncovered. International Institute of Tropical Agriculture affairs rice as appropriate crop on lower farm during the rainy season.

Internal: Large House contingent hauls to Lagos to attend naming ceremony for Sakinotu Ogunbiyi, daughter of Tajudeen.

Contradiction: Addressing the existential scream of the community. (Wk. 10)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Caritas Austria decision to do \$50,000 for second year in row becomes significant authorization sign.

Internal: House participates in "Kingdom of God" collegium and Week II contemporary parables; send out CYF Team, two Operations teams (Paris and UK) and Hamans to "US 12".

Contradiction: Holding tension among global priorities enabling Continental decisions to reach fruition. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS,

External: Area meeting declares next three weeks Operation Golden Flame. Four TMs turn two more Belgian provinces gold with remaining provinces scheduled for next week. Invitation to address West Flanders Davids font village leaders meeting breaks open possibility of 150 TMs next year.

Internal: Kingdom of God collegium and Week II writing of contemporary parables impacts House and Nexus. Send out of CYF teams to Germany, Carin Schuchart to Chicago, and two operations teams to Paris and UK and Hamans to US 12.

Contradiction: Not stumbling in our eagerness to finish Belgium. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Twenty-six colleagues from across the Netherlands gather to hear each other's stories about Wales, Kapini, Kelapa Dua and Maharashtra, and discover each other as the movement in Holland. At least one "yes" and one probable are secured for U.S. Consults.

Internal: Dutch nurse, Paula Hondeman, returns from India excited and full of stories, just in time to greet Jorrit van Wijk, who begins sojourn in preparation for work in Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Creating the structure that ensures ongoing engagement activities for the many colleagues emerging. (Wk. 6)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: One community youth forum and one youth town meeting highlight the week while set up work continues in seven other lands for TM.

Internal: House welcomes Marsha Hahn and Mary Boivin for youth forum trek.

Contradiction: Covering the appointments, programs, and set up work already scheduled in all 11 states in this next week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Completion of Fassade of "Treffpunkt" demonstrates seriousness and adds a touch of sparkle to the street while ink paint and linoleum worth 1000s of DMs enables interior of treffpunkt to be near completion. First community event is a play by children at local school attended by 100 people.

Internal: Send out of Mary Jane on Indian dance group tour shifts responsibilities and enables new roles.

Contradiction: Expanding the base of community participation and arenas in which to develop leadership. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: ICA visits State House and the office of the President to report on KHDP progress and to present document and letter to His Excellency, Dr. Kaunda, and receives an invitation to have regular meetings. The roof for the new preschool is raised under leadership of local Party committee. Six WHO doctors working with Health Caretakers in five stakes do medical checkups, and are amazed at stake organization that allows 210 to be examined in one morning.

Internal: Sr. Regina Ramos, PLC grad, joins auxiliary from the White Sisters of Africa. Campfire celebration marks closing of the Lusaka based House. Joseph Mwenya returns from 5th City. Charles Hahn and Barbara Williams arrive with edge Europe reports. House sends out Nancy Prather and Jeanne Wilson on GWF trek.

Contradiction: Extending HDP impact from the center to the total community. (Wk. 9)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Thursday leadership meeting is a signal demonstration of ability of village leadership to move it and build consensus.

Internal: Cleaning up House space, veterinary yard and planting trees and flowers signal turn toward space care.

Contradiction: Sustaining the complexity while assuring the necessary catalytic victories. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: "Eve in Kawangware" allows discovery of new colleagues in midst of auction of Kawangware products. Economic Commission, consisting of Agriculture and Construction Guilds, fill community centre as they initiate monthly meetings. Kawangware Management Training Course begins in great style with ten present. Comartka has new order for 500 sets of three-nested baskets.

Internal: Ita Muller stops in to collect trunk purchased at Guardians Meeting, stays for Ecclesiola and makes plans to visit Houston House.

2 Contradiction: Doing the Completion in five weeks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP

External: Local people negotiate and begin work on five contracts for water tanks. Co-op makes assignments to negotiate land for marketplace. Nutrition garden is cultivated by local health caretakers. New seed nursery is cleared with help of farmers. Pre-school begins nutritious lunch program. Stone school building gets roof.

Internal: House is reminded that it is using borrowed facilities as it cleans and clears the church for Pentecost services.

Contradiction: Learning to operate efficiently when communications are time- and energy-consuming. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP**

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6) dldld

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY BOMBAY

External: Invitation mailed to only two representatives from each of 44 village projects to attend Quarter Council in order to plan the "Do-ment of the 25". New phone installed in downtown office of ICA.

Internal: Annie and MC Thomas celebrate birth of baby girl.

Contradiction: Breaking open the public and private sectors fast enough to suit current demands for the Do-ment of the 25. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at

Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambeir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in all of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON-ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge wover Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to

closing celebration and agreed to donate 3,000 Ruppes worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins ProZ5ct battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole GAngapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Village visitation, site selection and blitz by Vivian and Roger in the killing heat wave of 120degrees Fahrenheit, and picking up on old authorization contacts, particularly government.

Internal: Marie and Dolly hold the fort while House leaves for the council at Maliwada and other destinations and sent out celebration for Bevin who leaves for the student house Chicagol

Contradiction: Finding new maneuvers for authorization and funding in the midst of putting a name tag on a village for area Delhi. (Wk. 10)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: There are new pairs of bullocks are purchased with newly received bank loans, in 108 degree heat! One new small temple is built and a rebuilt temple is inaugurated with all staff present in Harrijan stake. Massive invisible face lift continues while 25 full paying members initiate the new cooperative society. Translation of pre-school rituals into Telegu changes images of teachers. The final sight for the drinking water well is established.

Internal: All auxiliary spend a Sunday of discontinuity in

Hyderabad seeing a new Hindi movie and eating a fine meal.

Contradiction: Holding a tension between the necessity of local control and the responsibility to adopt new techniques of operation which will change the out-moded operating image of the village as outlined in the document contradictions. (Wk. 4)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Sent Operation to Sungai Lui for Industry trek. Management goes to Sungai Lui for clarifying their ambiguities. Dick visits Medan and Ufung Pandan for site selection.

Internal: Played the revolving door dynamic and welcomed the Wedge, Arca Prior, Dick West, Marge Tomlinson, Kim Thornton, Garnet Gankd and Laurie Mitche. Sharing the stories of the blobbe at colleigum with presence of the Panchayat.

Contradiction: Stnaidng present to the coprehensive when the nitty-grityt consumes you. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SURUSUP HDP

External: Services beyond the call of duty through private sector, with local gestner producint immediate consult brochure; state goveremnt visits resulting in practical authorization assistance and local headman and leaders enthusiasm to begin project immediately.

Internal: Recruiting 30 consultants in one week while at same time obtain services and aid without inking in Sabah. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Great guild meetings with many new faces follow intensive recruitment drive by village leaderhsip group which named two people from each Stake to form the core of each Guild and then hand delivered invitation letters to all.

Internal: Celebrative life of auxiliary accelerates as neighboring Peace Corps friend invites all to mutton barbeque feast, impromptu Hearts tournament fills the void of rainy night meeting cancellation and metro family attends ecclewsiola to symbolize new decision for global assignment.

Contradiction: Catalyzing village leaderhsip to see urgency of great Stake Meetings and visable project results. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DU A HDP

External: Emphasis is on agriculture and visibility as 12 farmers in rice experiment harvest IR36 rice, yielding 2½ to 3 tons peper hectre (triple the previous harvest); mung beans are planted; home gardens in stakes are begun; chillies are harvested; and pre-school is repaired and painted.

Internal: Experiencing luxury in newly-painted facility.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP)

Internal: Villager Kim Chang Shik has Open House in his new house with auxiliary. House members climb Mt. Halla to view annual Azalea Festival.

External: Kuh Du E Ri forms its guilds with 106 members and holds the first meeting with each guild choosing five sub-tactics to complete during the next few weeks. Village workday completes playground and rock garden in the village par. v County and provincial officials continue visiting. Typesetting of the document is completed (indind). Two bicycles are acquired.

Internal: Auxiliary area Pior and Kwangyung II prior hold celebration in Seroul marking the great transition that the movement is going through at thsi time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House hosts local ladies at first GWF brunch, viewing lides of the HDP projects and talk about some future possibilities for women.

Internal: University students stop in to talk over new possibilities in town meeting/Chiiki Kan Don Kai planning.

Contradiction: Using colleagues for our needs rather than being used. (Wk. 7)s,

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: In two Global Women's Forums held this week, Japanese leadership experiences need to be fully responsible.

Internal: Japanese colleague leads Seminary -- wants to be a leader.

Contradiction: Uncovering the treasure of local passion that will break the blocks for Town Meeting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Shi-cho saturation, Town Meeting circuit in Shizunai polis nets one date set for June 8th. Week II with gridding of Region and Hokkaido Metro to micros (three local volunteers participate and lead evening session) Summer Volunteer brochure distribution. Bonsai Club meets and seeds given as gift from Ivy City staff. Coal sculpture marketing set in motion. Sister from a French order in Sapporo phones to register for ITI.

Internal: Two birthdays celebrated: Kent Tomlinson and Pamela Bergdall. Michael and Molly Shaw announce pending birth of a new Shaw in November. Garden is created and planted behind Auxiliary House with the help of village women. Sunday picnic and cherry blossom viewing and softball in spite of rainy day. Guest from Finland-linguist researcher.

Contradiction: Securing Japanese volunteer staff for summer and full time staff for the year. (Wk. 8)

SYDN EY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Win comes in the form of \$49,000 from the Department of Aboriginal Affairs for 14 programs and salaries for Murrin B idge HDP.

Internal: The global team visits. Bob Vance gives a report

on TM in North America, providing images for reflection to turn Australia gold.

Contradiction: Meshing world's timeline with ours to release money and troops. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Held 5 community meetings, increasing total by one-third; set up three more while making presentation to first metropolitan council; local warriors meet and assist in drawing up 300 community meeting charts.

Internal: Record a record wage week and welcome seven sojourners.

Contradiction: Structuring internal networks to rapidly transmit wisdom across the geography for the sake of winning the campaign. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: dy people visit for Mur in Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as areal demands shift. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Melbourne guardians complete tables and blackboards for HDTS, participants pitch their tents and dig toilets, and Richard Evans leads a midnight trip to the water pump to service it. 20 tons of material arrive on long-awaited barge whose owner exclaims, "Wonders never cease, do they? as HDTS troops unload. Land rights advocate and economist Steve Zorn donates time meeting with the community and catalyzing telegrams to national leaders urging care for the autonomy of aboriginal communities in regard to mining rights.

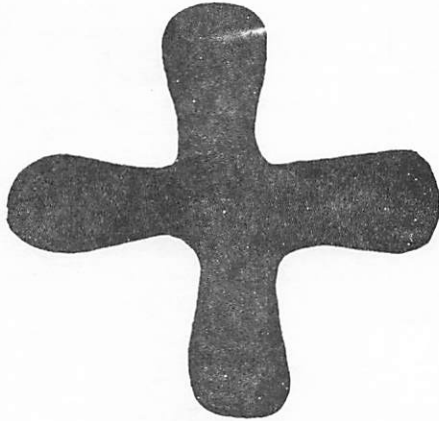

Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalamahir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a diary scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Ranganath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON-ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP)

Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Village visitation, site selection and blitz by Vivian and Roger in the killing heat wave of 120degrees Fahrenheit, and picking up on old authorization contacts, particularly government.

Internal: Marie and Dolly hold the fort while House leaves for the council at Maliwada and other destinations and sent out celebration for Bevin who leaves for the student house Chicagol

Contradiction: Finding new maneuvers for authorization and funding in the midst of putting a name tag on a village for area Delhi. (Wk. 10)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Drinking water well is dug to a depth of four meters X 12 meters. More than 150 women of all ages and castes come together to see demonstration of Chaika (cotton spinning), with 34 signed up to work in the Nadlapur Chaika Unit Week 10. Plans have been made to have 50 machines delivered; training continues. This is Nadlapur's first industry. Home demonstrations begin with new cooking techniques and a baby feeding program. Visit from Monitoring and Economic Acceleration launches HDP into week-long battleplanning for implementation of small industries to double the income in one year. Bank loans come in for more than 64,000 rupees. Village vegetable garden begins to pour out produce.

Internal: Staff welcomes Parekh, Slicker, Patterson and Gilles, who allow auxiliary to appropriate seemingly forgotten victories.

Contradiction: Prioritizing time for battleplanning and creating appropriate decor for Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Sent Operation to Sungai Lui for Industry trek. Management goes to Sungai Lui for clarifying their ambiguities. Dick visits Medan and Ufung Pandan for site selection.

Internal: Played the revolving door dynamic and welcomed the Wedge, Area Prior, Dick West, Marge Tomlinson, Kim Thornton, Garnet Gankd and Laurie Mitche. Sharing the stories of the globe at colleigum with presence of the Panchayat.

Contradiction: Stnaiding present to the coprehensive when the nitty-grityt consumes you. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SURUSUP HDP

Internal: Celebrative life of auxiliary accelerates as neighboring Peace Corps friend invites all to mutton barbeque feast, impromptu Hearts tournament fills the void of rainy night meeting cancellation and metro family attends ecclewsiola to symbolize new decision for global assignment.

Contradiction: Catalyzing village leaderhsip to see urgency of great Stake Meetings and visable project results. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Emphasis is on agriculture and visibility as 12 farmers in rice experiment harvest IR36 rice, yielding 2½ to 3 tons peper hectre (triple the previous harvest); mung beans are planted; home gardens in stakes are begun; chillies are harvested; and pre-school is repaired and painted.

Reports come in from victorious first week of Philippine Frenzy: 24 GCFs held from northernmost to southernmost province. The Bank Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation, donates \$1,200 (US). Hai Ou gets inkind tractor.

Internal: Jim and Bruce return and report on Tokyo, Seoul and Taipei treks. Nuxus hosts two Indian Guardians to delicious vegetable curry dinner. Hello and goodbye is said to Wedge team on way to Korea at Sheraton Hotel's Sky Lounge overlooking Hong Kong harbour.

Previously reticent elderly join elderly outing to Chinese antiquities exhibition. A workday of painting, repairing, fixing rooves and planting flowers is topped by villager cooking lunch for work force.

Internal: Esther Rowe treats House to a show of her trip to Canton. Oyubari sends newsletter full of reports of a Guardian's visit to Nam Wai. Wedge team visits for 1/2 hour to get a feel for Project situation.

Contradiction: Finding a creative tension between the necessary preparation for world's fair and increasing the momentum in the programs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Hai Ou's Tsuen Chang (village leader) decides to go to Chicago for the Summer Program, re-decides because of his grandmother's failing health, adn re-decides again after China Times prints the news of his trip and "all of Taiwan" wants to know "When are yougoing"?

Internal: The staff enjoys the Bruce Lee movie "A Game of Death" at the invitation of metro colleagues.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum goign with village leaders relative to the practical task. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Community Forum: Philippines completes second phase with only 12 provinces to go in the final week. Movement communities are chosen by governors for Forums to be held in rural villages. A participant from one community without electricity, communication and with archaic farming methods said, "The Forum has restored our self-confidence and shows us we can solve our own problems."

Internal: Planning continues to Assembly to be held in conjunction with Sudtonggan two-year completion celebration.

Contradiction: Showing the same possibility in 33,000 villages in the Philippines. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Taipei collegas are excited by global priorities, 77-78 summary report at House-Metro Meeting.

Internal: Baby girl Thomas, "Tang Sha Lin" (Sharon Lyn Thomas) receives her Republic of China passport.

Contradiction: Handling authorization matters while moving ahead directly with the task of local human development. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Pressure of world fair deadline pushes everyone to Herculean effort: finish the square, windmill, rain catchment, Buri II building, and Early Learning Center. Rotary presentation is a great success as they resolve to raise \$750 matching funds with Seattle University Club, . Saturday workday is celebrated with a community movie.

Internal: Mark Jewell and Kim Rafos are hosted on CYF trek.

Contradiction: Getting things set up so that HDP knows itself to be thriving while ICA staff are gone for the weekend. (Wk. 11)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Sea-Land Company sends 150,000 yen and Masuda San says that he will represent sanya at the donation of the gift bus at the Fukuda residence. a "Small but Beautiful" GWF was held and the Development team has a breakthrough call with Nissan Motors, referring ICA to five other companies.

Internal: Lee Ferguson adds another new job to his schedule: Kanda Gaigo Gakuin English teaching. The Area Logistics team is sent out in three directions: Osaka, Fukuoka, Sapporo, leaving Tokyo House typist overwhelmed and newly opened permeation possibilities.

Office training is begun for six positions: secretary, paymaster, banker, KITCO bookkeeper, public relations and a purchasing agent.

Internal: Three anthropologists and one archeologist come to dinner and talk.

Utilizing inexperience of current in-house troops to break loose new approaches to development, guardian enlistment, office management and intensified regional gunning of the Three Campaigns. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: A welcome home breakfast is held for the three Lake Tyres HDTs participants, Fred, Owen and Melville, revealing solid affirmation of the HDTs, Oombulgurri, its people and the experience.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE - MELBOURNE)

Internal: Kathryn Telford returns from youth trek and holds up the experience of the youth working shoulder-to-shoulder with Robert Roberts rebuilding the Oombulgurri basketball court.

Contradiction: Turning the Australian aboriginal crisis to advantage. (Wk. 11)

Contradiction. Using the Consult as the primary tool to spark engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE-RICHGROVE HDP

External: First community meeting in Richgrove following the decision to be the California Human Development Project attended by 85 local residents, culminates in 50 more homes being visited on Saturday, the first block meeting with 25 attending, the commitment of a Consult facility, and distribution of the first Richgrove Voice to all homes.

Internal: Receive visitors from the region, are and Kreuzberg Ost; welcome Jane and Otto Sharp. State Senator. State Representative, and key County Commissioner attend opening feast for consult.

Contradiction: Galvanizing community support into a continuing commitment. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Colleagues man the office and hit the road simultaneously as consultant recruitment swings into high gear.

Internal: April challenge money total is over half, just ahead of schedule as colleagues respond to immediate needs.

Contradiction: Nailing down the yeses and journeying possibilities through to commitment. (Wk. 4)

Contradiction: Dealing with the no which is forming as the community says yes. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTs and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)

A new Academy brochure reflects the impact of the four fold spiral of the new curriculum design. Corporate reflection from the Global Trek pushes all to deal seriously with the question, "How can we best serve the world through every aspect of our missional life, and sustain the troops in the process?" The key contradiction is pushing through obscurities in the area of the GRA to create an operating image that will release and inform the future.

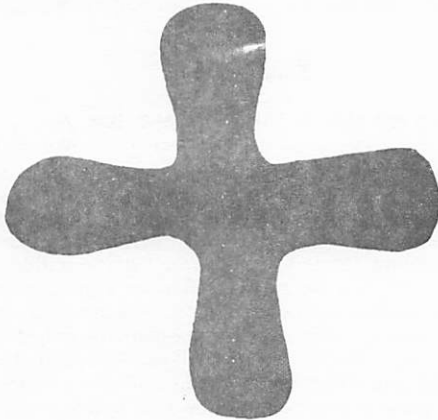

Contradiction: Obtaining the relevant data to show the results of two years of HDP. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House participates in area Council, London, filled with great reports, manoeuvres, task forces and celebrations as we approach the end of the year of the United Kingdom and look beyond.

Internal: Kingdom of God collegium pushes to new depth and Robert Allan sees London as part of preparation for sixth-grade trek and Student House.

Contradiction: Learning how to take the pain of Scotland and turn it to the TM advantage. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAIRGWAITH HDP

External: Visits by Development Centrum for a 'tour' of the project along with others such as the Probation Officer for the County continue to be most supportive and willing to plug in where needed. County delivers the wood and other supplies needed for the repair of the bus shelter.

Internal: Evening at the home of the District Education Officer is socially and missionally helpful—a delicious buffet served with a view of the valley.

Contradiction: Focusing on the three month task while an office and housing facility are not immediately available. (Wk. 6)

External: Forum Communautaire held in Herbseim colors the Alsace region yellow. An appointment with the Co-Action Programme of UNESCO yields an invitation to submit a proposal for funding and to display HDP items at the UNESCO handcraft fair next fall.

Internal: Lucille Tessier arrives from Belgium to help finish coloring France yellow. First paycheck from the Sorbonne arrives to boost income. Sunday morning campaign planning session, and the arrival of Claire Whitney and Tom Greyshock disclose the momentum that's exploding the GCF campaign.

Contradiction: Sharpening the GCF story to cut through new contingencies brought on by seasonal (June) events. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Dr. D'Angelo from Regional Agricultural Department visits local farms to view demonstration plots. His comment is that renewal is really going on here. First two litters of rabbits born—17 rabbit cages are built. Market umbrella canvas tops are finished by six women in Industry Guild. Council of Europe regional representative sets June 8 date to spell out model for financial assistance.

Internal: Trips to Assisi, Subiaco, Fontecolombo ground House members in lives of Italian saints. Bob Rank pops in for a visit and inkinds toothbrushes for all Terminese. Marsha Hahn and Mary Boivin arrive for CYF.

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Material for first 4,000 bedsheets for the sewing industry arrives catalyzing factory set-up, employee engagement (12, including 11 families and all stakes) and 744 sewn sheets in two days initiating possibilities for expansion to 50,000 sheets a month and 150 employees: Australian High Commission visits and indicates plans to finance one production line (6 machines, 1 loom, 4800 USD), May development has in hand \$11,520(USD), including surprise \$6,160USD grant submitted a year ago.

Internal: May maneuvers are finished and celebrated with roasted pig, Zambian.

Contradiction: Keeping all horizons in focus while concentrating on one key victory. (Wk. 12)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The 100th TM in Europe and the 33rd in Belgium are completed, giving a boost to Europe going gold.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality focusing on symbolic life is address to all. Grand celebration with champaign and steak marks Belgium going gold.

Contradiction: Doing continental visioning that propels into next year.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Set-up meetings are scheduled in two more provinces. Four TMs held in Limberg raise up new workshop leaders and orchestrators.

Internal: Kingdom of God collegium and Week II writing of contemporary parables impacts House and Nexus. Send out of CYF team to Germany, Carin Schuchart to Chicago, and two Operations teams to Paris and UK and Hamans to USA 12.

Contradiction: Not stumbling in eagerness to finish Belgium. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The half-way mark is reached with two TMs this week. A surprise donation of \$2,500 pushes Area Brussels over its quarter's Development goal.

Internal: Amsterdam becomes global crossroads as Ken Gilbert stops on his way from Nigeria and Jesse and Claire Clements and Bevin Innes stop on way from India.

Contradiction: Dealing with the vision and contradictions as well as the nitty-gritties. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: New funding orbits emerge with five day women's Development circuits in the Ruhr Valley yielding 710 marcs in hand and in-kind newspaper spread on Indonesian Projects with appeal for donations as well as promised income from street festivals and Christmas bazaars. Rheinland Pflaz goes gold with TM in village of Lorzweiler.

Internal: Areal management PSU in Berlin deals with issues of public relations, legalization and finances. Inger Bartram remains to participate in the Project for a week. Remaining members of House and Emerging Generation attend kindergarten summer festival

Contradiction: Deciding best strategic use of summer months with no prospect of continental gathering before September. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Completion of "Treffpunkt" demonstrates seriousness and adds a touch of sparkle to the street while inkind paint and linoleum worth 1,000 marcs enables interior of treffpunkt to be near completion. First community event is a play by children at local school attended by 100 people.

Internal: House sends out Mary Jane Elliott on Indian dance group tour, shifting responsibilities and enabling new roles.

Contradiction: Expanding the base of community participation and arena in which to develop leadership. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: All-village work day transforms entrance to KHDP off tarmac. District governor takes second look as he passes en route to Lusaka. Champion grader does the major roadway through Project. *The Call of Kapini* newsletter is named, designed, workshopped and written by guilders at weekly meeting. Farmers harvest from Demonstration Farm is begun with first vegetables selling at a good price in Lusaka. New irrigation pump and pipe are installed as river dam is completed. Kapini farmers meet to objectify farming situation and discuss future plans. Tobacco Board, ZAMPORK and Refined Oil Products hold meetings in village to present proposals for new cash farming ventures.

Internal: HDP sends out Carin Schuchart to USA 12 Consults following intensive health work in Kapini.

Contradiction: Maintaining KHDP weekly structures and operations as 1/3 staff is assigned out to Development and Village Meeting. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Thursday leadership meeting is a signal demonstration of ability of village leadership to move it and build consensus.

Internal: Cleaning up House space, veterinary yard and planting trees and flowers signal turn toward space care.

Contradiction: Sustaining the complexity while assuring the necessary catalytic victories. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Over 170 attend exciting Kawangware Youth Corps parent/teacher's meeting. Seaside Safari maneuver takes area team into Mombasa to discover eight villages as prospects for third HDP. Fine support comes from business community with 15,000k (Kenya shillings) in hand, and green light comes from the government for site search within constraints of cholera quarantine. Team is excited to realize that coastal province is already yellow. Site visit to Kawangware for World Education Associates is great happening. First edition of the *Kawangware Voice* is distributed.

Internal: House attends national celebration of Madaraha Day rally in Uhuru Park followed by wild breakloose of action and spirit in midst of picnic and football. Kawangware Post creates nine maneuvers for completion.

Contradiction: Pushing through to do necessary task when clarity of demand over next 28 days brings temptation to reduce vision and action. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI—KAMWELINI HDP

External: Progress is accelerated on the Community Center as plastic is inkind and walls are plastered. Commission

meetings come alive as the guilds present concrete proposals. Wednesdays are established as Farmers's Association Day when meetings and farm work days impact the community with corporate style. Thursday becomes Stake Day with total stake calling in the morning followed by stake meetings in the afternoon. The sleeve industry forges ahead with 50,000 weekly production mark, and the construction industry celebrates the establishment of income producer with landing outside contracts for 600 water jars.

Internal: Troops experience corporateness as all the forces are thrown into stake calling.

Contradiction: Operating on revolutionary timeline. (Wk. 11)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17) and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takali for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Invitation mailed to only two representatives from each of the 44 village projects to attend Quarter Council in order to plan the "Do-ment of the 25." New phone installed in downtown office of ICA.

Internal: Annie and M.C. Thomas celebrate birth of baby girl.

Contradiction: Breaking open the public and private sectors fast enough to suit current demands for the Do-ment of the 25. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR—KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebrations.

Internal: House sen House sen House sen House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for Council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH—VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Auti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a diary scheme, poultry farm and general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON—TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satura, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared by each of six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstructino. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Manila Mandal has successful GWF in Satura and village sends two women to the Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Galkwad and S. Galkwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE UTI—UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI—SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of *Shivni Voice* is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic look. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON—ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately launched with two women vounteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of

poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyed in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary. House sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI—TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON—MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Village visitation, site selection and blitz by Vivian and Roger in the killing heat wave of 120 degrees Fahrenheit, and picking up on old authorization contacts, particularly government.

Internal: Marie and Dolly hold the fort while House leaves for the council at Maliwada and other destinations and send out celebration for Bevin who leaves for the Student House in Chicago.

Contradiction: Finding new maneuvers for authorization and funding in the midst of putting a name tag on a village for Area Delhi. (Wk. 10)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Drinking water well is dug to a depth of four meters X 12 meters. More than 150 women of all ages and castes come together to see demonstration of Chaika (cotton spinning), with 34 signed up to work in the Nadlapur Chaika Unit Week 10. Plans have been made to have 50 machines delivered; training continues. This is Nadlapur's first industry. Home demonstrations begin with new cooking techniques and a baby feeding program. Visit from Monitoring and Economic Acceleration launches HDP into week-long battleplanning for implementation of small industries to double the income in one year. Bank loans come in for more than 64,000 rupees. Village vegetable garden begins to pour out produce.

Internal: Staff welcomes Parekh, Slicker, Patterson and Gilles, who allow auxiliary to appropriate seemingly

forgotten victories.

Contradiction: Prioritizing time for battleplanning and creating appropriate dcor for Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Wedge team leaves Serusup Consult team, consultants. Villagers arrive and Consult begins 28 May.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality educates House in basic skills of House management with tour demonstration.

Contradiction: Building maneuvers for funding management and Project support to keep up with acceleration pace of CYF, GCF, GSD, HDTs. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SURUSUP HDP

External: Local Gestetner producer prints Consult brochure. The state government visits, resulting in practical authorization assistance. Local headman and leaders show enthusiasm to begin HDP immediately.

Internal: House makes final preparations to ready practices for the Consult victory.

Contradiction: Recruiting 30 consultants in one week while at the same time obtaining services and aid.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Great guild meetings with many new faces follow intensive recruitment drive by village leadership group, which named two people from each Stake to form the core of each Guild and then hand delivered invitation letters to all.

Internal: Celebrative life of auxiliary accelerates as neighboring Peace Corps friend invites all to mutton barbeque feast, impromptu Hearts tournament fills the void of rainy night meeting cancellation, and metro family attends ecclesiola to symbolize new decision for global assignment.

Contradiction: Catalyzing village leadership to see urgency of grat Stake Meetings and visible project results. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Indonesian Government officially approves proposal for a project in South Sulawesi (BONTOA) six days after proposal was submitted. An 11-member board is formed of villagers for the credit union. Training begins for chicken industry with 13 attending. New rail (bamboo) fence is built along main road through the village. One villager and two Indonesian bridges are repaired in preparation for June 10 celebration.

Internal: James Carmichael, the man in charge of the Canadian Embassy funding programs, brings his wife and two small children to stay overnight at the Project. Soehardi's father visits for one week and helps to harvest mungbeans. Project obtains a bolt of blue cloth and everyone is making a new blue shirt for the 10 June celebration.

Contradiction: Moving the village leadership quickly so that they see that the 10 June celebration is being planned and carried out by the village people, while at the same time getting all the preparation finished in four days. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole house is required for Sabah consult. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development treks go to Tokyo and Taipei. Nexus stuffs and mails 2,200 technicolor Nam Wai brochures to Hong Kong Chamber of Commerce. Reports come in from vitorious first week of Philippine Frenzy: 24 GCFs held from northernmost to southernmost provinces. The Bank of Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation donates \$1,200 (US). Hai Ou gets inkir. tractor.

Internal: Jim and Bruce return and report on Tokyo, Seoul and Taipei treks. Nexus hosts two Indian Guardians to delicious vegetable curry dinner. Hello and goodbye is said to Wedge team on way to Korea at Sheraton Hotel's Sky Lounge overlooking Hong Kong harbour.

Contradiction: Discerning how to use troops most effectively the next two months. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Over 2,200 Development brochures are mailed via Chamber of Commerce. Villagers help to carry out baby beauty competition. Crop is planted in first large commercial mushroom house. Previously reticent elderly join elderly outing to Chinese antiquities exhibition. A workday of painting, repairing, fixing rooves and planting flowers is topped by villager cooking lunch for work force.

Internal: Esther Rowe treats House to a show of her trip to Canton. Oyubari sends newsletter full of reports of a Guardian's visit to Nam Wai. Wedge team visits for ½ hour to get a feel for Project situation.

Contradiction: Finding a creative tension between the necessary preparation for World's Fair and increasing the momentum in the programs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Newly initiated 4H Club will not be blocked and finds new location to prepare for pig raising project. Village beautification has caught on and villagers now bring new plants for all the planters and assist in the planting and care.

Internal: Weekly collegium of Chinese lessons enables more spontaneous relations with the village.

Contradiction: Learning patience while the village follows through on the tasks constantly slowed down by red tape. relative to the practical task. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Community Forum: Philippines completes second phase with only 12 provinces to go in the final week. Movement communities are chosen by governors for Forums to be held in rural villages. A participant from one community without electricity, communication and archaic farming methods said, "The Forum has restored our self-confidence and shows us we can solve our own problems."

Internal: Planning continues to Assembly to be held in conjunction with Sudtonggan two-year completion celebration.

Contradiction: Showing the same possibility in 33,000 villages in the Philippines. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Taipei colleagues are excited by global priorities, 77-78 summary report at House-Metro meeting.

Internal: Baby girl Thomas, "Tang Sha Lin" (Sharon Lyn Thomas) receives her Republic of China passport.

Contradiction: Handling authorization matters while moving ahead directly with the task of local human development. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Streams of people begin to arrive back from painting Philippines yellow to put final touches on the village — just to remind all that the job is never finished. Lightning hits generator and burns out system.

Internal: House overflows with celebration as old and new colleagues gather for GCF Assembly and World's

Contradiction: Finishing the training school grant. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: House holds two fantastic CYFs in Davao City and Langub. Lumber is inkinded for charcoal bodega. Langub youth organize into an action group with definite plans for improving the path to the spring. Rotary presentation is a great success as they resolve to raise \$750 matching funds with Seattle University Club. Saturday workday is celebrated with a community movie.

Internal: Mark Jewell and Kim Rafos are hosted on CYF trek.

Contradiction: Getting things set up so that HDP knows itself to be thriving while ICA staff are gone for the weekend. (Wk. 11)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Sea-Land Company sends 150,000 yen and Masuda San says that he will represent sanya at the donation of the gift bus at the Fukuda residence. A "Small but Beautiful" GWF was held and the Development team has a breakthrough call with Nissan Motors, referring ICA to five other companies.

Internal: Lee Ferguson adds another new job to his schedule: Kanda Gaigo Gakuin English teaching. The Area Logistics team is sent out in three directions: Osaka, Fukuoka, Sapporo, leaving Tokyo House typist overwhelmed and newly opened permeation possibilities.

Contradiction: Following up on ITI prospects personally while increasing permeation income. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Ice cream and popsicles come to Jeju with refrigeration fixed. Village treasury meeting at Seo Gwi has all the representatives present from each of the villages, including Ri Jang, village head. The preschool gets one more teacher from the village.

Internal: Shirley Mueller and Lee Jae Joon make fly paper to cut down the fly population. House water meter is repaired.

Contradiction: Intensifying the demands on guilders to release corporate power in the village. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Total village engages in annual rice planting, while county chief commits sprinkler systems (for two farmers who donated land) worth 700,000 (won), village assembly chooses new cooperative store manager, while Alan Khoo of ITT: Hong Kong visits. GRA and ITI recruitment go on in Seoul.

The Kuh Du E Ri HDP document is translated into Korean and typed for printing.

Internal: The Kuh Du E Ri HDP auxiliary engages in the wading-in-the-mud social liturgy of rice planting along with the Meyon Chief, village chief, Sae Maul leader, army troops and villagers followed by corporate lunch. A new Korean (Hangul) typewriter is acquired.

Contradiction: "Doing" the project before (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: First planning meeting in Tosu City happens. Saga prefecture gives hopeful impetus to campaign in Kyushu.

Internal: House women's group begins translation of ICA article and hosts some guests for Saturday night party, including students, friends and guild workers.

Contradiction: Exploring possibilities. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Development team arrives and begins the week by inking a new Olivetti Electric typewriter. Twenty calls give key introductions and \$500 committed through "pay India staff support" plan. In-depth push on workshop gets out practical presuppositions, trains five Japanese TM leaders and renews commitment and excitement to set up TMs.

Internal: Japanese TM staff joins House for Latin American launch party. A \$900 a month job for six hours a week, consulting with Bando Chemical Company, gives self support a big boost and points way to new opportunities. Logistics task force arrives for Development and ITI acceleration.

Contradiction: Releasing colleagues to take responsibility in many arenas. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Invitations are printed and mailed for the *First Year Celebration*. ITI circuit to Sapporo continues on to Hakodate during Week 2 with circuiters staying at LaSalle High School. A visit to the Sapporo Trade Association with Mr. Hibino of Oyubari investigates coal sculpture market. Area logistic team, Molly Shaw and Carl Hickey, arrive to focus on ITI. Yuko Yoshida does phone blitz for TM follow-up. Summer volunteers from Hokkaido University are enlisted.

Internal: Miss Nakamura arrives from Tokyo to spend five days doing volunteer work with the ICA. Two new jobs are secured. Key conversation happens on getting Japanese troops here for the summer.

Contradiction: Catalyzing local support for the celebration on June 15. (Wk. 11)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Win comes in the form of \$49,000 from the Department of Aboriginal Affairs for 14 programs and salaries for Murrin Bridge HDP.

Internal: The global team visits. Bob Vance gives a report on TM in North America, providing images for reflection to turn Australia gold.

Contradiction: Meshing world's timeline with ours to release money and troops. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Anita Harvey takes responsibility for Albany set up, five regional colleagues help with circuits, three CMAs are held and 2,500 workbooks are printed. The CMAs allow golding in every sector, while four set-up dates are made in southwest and metro sectors.

Internal: Five youth return from holiday trip to Oombulgurri, full of stories and excitement. Sue Chapman returns from HDTS with lively stories of victories. Tim Wegner joins John Telford in Perth to do the Goldfields CMAs.

Contradiction: Re-thinking global commonness in the light of increasing publicity. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Key people visit for Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on Area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as areal demands shift. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI—OMBULGURRI HDP

External: Youth trek of 16 Order youth impacts Oombulgurri with enthusiasm and a new basketball court. The Hard Rock Cafe opens for the first time with meat pasties as the highlight. Enough money is made to pay bills, wages, and save money for future equipment. Office training begins for six positions: secretary, paymaster, banker, Kitcom bookkeeper, public relations and a purchasing agent.

Internal: Three anthropologists and one archeologist come to dinner and talk.

Contradiction: Building authentic structures for dealing with decisionmaking. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Six Community Meetings are set up at the start of River Rock manoeuver.

Internal: The day after returning from trekking, Sue Wegner gives birth to Dietrich Wegner a month early.

Contradiction: Keeping the mission support system going in the face of unknown troop fluctuations. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Nine Apex men become task force to Murrin Bridge HDP for Queen's birthday weekend to complete repairs on community church. New million dollar foundation puts ICA in top two for possible large donation and key referrals.

Internal: Order is represented at Telford family funeral. Great discontinuous fireside ecclesiola is highlighted by toasting marshmallows and sing-along with Rolf Harris. Melbourne men drop by on way to next manoeuver.

Contradiction: Gathering all the wisdom of an area council while scattered all over the continent. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: HDTS is completed at Oombulgurri, a great victory with participants from four states and eight aboriginal communities. The next phase of the Oombulgurri maneuvers are planned. Alcoa sends \$2,000 and an appointment to see foundation head for a large grant.

Internal: Development PSU hosts eight around the table.

Contradiction: Allowing government to take a new relationship to the aboriginal and CMA programs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Development team travels to Ipswich and Toowoomba, reaping \$100 first visit and new contacts. Goodna Jaycees say yes to CMA on June 24.

Internal: "Tales of Power" impact House.

Contradiction: Having all the strategy for dealing with people who are colleagues or doers. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Completion of house fences moves ahead with two families deciding to help each other, and five people then working on one fence. Guild spaces are designated and transformation begins. Department of Aboriginal Affairs and State Member of Parliament visit.

Internal: Sydney colleague is sent out after one week sojourn; Area Development team arrives for weekend to plan inkind and introduces a maneuver "pallet" tool.

Contradiction: Building and maintaining the corporation consciousness and decision in the face of a reluctance to participate in the meeting dynamic. (Wk. 10)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Two great launchings in one week—the community fishing boat on Saturday with 300 Showpiece celebrators (it is a traditional Marshallese outrigger) and the First Region Agana Town Meeting circuit on Wednesday, with the Baileys off to Ponape, Truk and Guam for a month.

Internal: Sunday's aborted attempt to go to Rong Rong for a picnic and research provided a great opportunity for a picnic in the House and radically grounded the contradiction of inadequate transportation even within an atoll.

Contradiction: Perceiving the comprehensive imperative that requires a creative response and corporateness. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Suifage village celebration is held to celebrate the GCF document completion and decision to use preproposal to begin agricultural program. A group from Slufaga is interviewed on national radio and they sing the village song. Afterwards they visit the House in the evening for proposal workshop and form plans for a Yoth Plantation in the village. ITI grad offers to help with HDP site selections.

Internal: House participates in Pentecost service in local church with crew members of German cruiser, Deutschland, in two languages.

Contradiction: Keeping old grads significantly engaged while impacting new colleagues with possibilities of engagement. (Wk. 11)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Six Guardians travel to Richgrove to participate in pre-consult planning on the sewer system, ending with the completed application. Consultant recruitment continues and inkind blitz nets flour, fish, beans, fruits and an electrical junction box.

Internal: House welcomes back Barbara and Bob Prather from three months of working with Town Meeting; Iowa, the April Guardian's Consult, and a visit to Inyan Wakagapi.

Contradiction: Using the Consult as the primary tool to spark engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: First community meeting in Richgrove following the decision to be the California Human Development Project attended by 85 local residents, culminates in 50 more homes being visited on Saturday, the first block meeting with 25 attending, the commitment of a Consult facility, and distribution of the first *Richgrove Voice* to all homes.

Internal: Colleagues from San Francisco and Los Angeles Regions, including a small army from the Fresno Metro Cadre, participate in the first community assembly and the "Casa a Casa" visits, welcoming the chance to utilize their bilingual abilities.

Contradiction: Actualizing California's potential in terms of consultant recruitment. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Completion of HDP Consult document is signal event with Cusick residents typing until 11:00 p.m. regularly in the midst of other community miracles involving 40 residents throughout the week, and four working with auxiliary to create implementaries.

Internal: Bob Vance gives report and spin revitalizing Town Meeting thrust and its relationship to HDP. Great excitement over taking the word of what's happening here to other communities.

Contradiction: Pulling together the diversity of launching 30 tactics all at once, creating a great internal explosion in community involvement and weaving it all into a thrust that wins. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Colleagues man the office and hit the road simultaneously as consultant recruitment swings into high gear.

Internal: April challenge money total is over half, just ahead of schedule as colleagues respond to immediate needs.

Contradiction: Nailing down the yeses and journeying possibilities through to commitment. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

Contradiction: Contemplating summer roles. (Wk. 11)

xRELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Community Truck Farm is completely planted with the help of work camp from Lafayette, Indiana, who also painted outside of store, cleaned out root cellar, built cotton wood shades, planted many flower beds, created day care playground and cut down the weeds in the parks.

Internal: House welcomes back auxiliary and locals from the Richgrove Consult and houses 33 people on the collegium room floor and enjoys the three day visit of Addie Lyman who brought the news from the just finished Academy.

Contradiction: Producing anticipation for the June 15 celebration and offering up the project as a sign of victory. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Slides shown to Methodist women in Boulder, to South Kiwanis Club and to a gathering at metro colleagues' house bring in consultant fees and expose many who have not heard to the HDPs.

Internal: Metro participation in House structures throughout the week symbolizes the care of the region and initiates a workday and great picnic in the mountains.

Contradiction: Developing the corporate stance that 'the buck stops here' while operating in uncertainty. (Wk. 7)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Initiated five week development blitz with \$475 in hand and \$3750 working which opens up new networks among architects and accountants, topped off with May 17th advocates event with representatives of six nations and public and private sector.

Internal: Week II is a round of celebrations as Timothy Wright is sent out at House Church to US 12 consult, initiating his "sabbatical" year of engagement, and house celebrates maneuver and Robert Tobin's birthday with Inkind chicken in the park.

Contradiction: While standing present to the global priorities spinning development and saturation and the area task into one operation to ensure total victory. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: New collegiality is birthed through GWF as women of widely diverse experience struggle to articulate ways of engaging in practical care for the world.

Internal: Colleagues from Vogar, Edmonton, Anchorage, and Vancouver celebrate the expenditure of weeks' work with in-kind feast at Keg 'n Cleaver Restaurant following GWF.

Contradiction: Using momentum of GWF happening to move colleagues into a summer of engagement. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: HDP site search continues with one adult, one youth and one Emerging Generation visiting villages on road systems out of Fairbanks. Howard Stoner is assigned to Vancouver Region to help set up GWFs.

Internal: Laying out the journey models for individuals and organizations that will lay the urgency of global mission upon them. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Two forums are held. Orchestration and assembly materials are ready with 20,000 sheets in-kind paper. Two colleagues are trained for orchestration for seven upcoming forums next week.

Internal: House celebrates **golding of province** with movie and midnight feast.

Contradiction: Beckoning attendance for the assembly when individuals in communities sense themselves burdened with the over-organization of groups. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Project director attends annual meeting of The Manitoba Metis Federation. Manager of Vogar Products, Sally Monkman, attends GWF while on marketing trip to Vancouver, and Vogar Construction Co. Ltd. submits first construction bid.

Internal: Frost takes its toll on tomato plants, reducing number by half. Marilyn Corcoran returns to Chicago after impacting Vogar for two months with her presence, and House participates in June planning.

Contradiction: Thinking through long-range planning with the community. (Wk. 12)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: GWF held in Houston's Whitehall Hotel was a great event. As one woman put it, "It has lifted the burdens from my head." Authorization and consultant recruitment for Asherton HDP continues.

Internal: Day of fasting is occasion for reflecting on 85—15%. Self-support push continues as two house members count absentee ballots for the Democratic primary and Rick Walters and Steve Gibson work Saturday in a fabricating shop.

Contradiction: Firming up consultant recruitment for Asherton. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Over 100 attend Community Rally to begin preparations for June 18—24 Consult. City clerk proclaims community resolve in opening context, "I do not want to be one of those folks who sit on the sidelines and then criticizes what gets done. When things begin to happen, I want to be able to say that I was there."

Internal: Community work day involves residents in painting and patching staff facilities. Inkinding is going great guns.

Contradiction: Establishing internal structures on the run as a demonstration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Sixty people attend Consult prep meeting and everyone volunteers for work. All stakes are visited with miracles planned in each stake and underway in three.

Contradiction: Releasing public utility services for HDP house. (Wk 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

Internal: House sends out Slicker Family to Indianhoma HDP and celebrates new House configuration with Fiesta at Panchos.

Contradiction: Putting together the new configuration of forces to complete the myriad of tasks. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Slide presentation at House, the First United Methodist Church and at a colleague's home reach key consultant prospects and net \$400. Paper and printing are inked to enable Texas Report to roll off the press this week. Guardian group goes to Asherton for workshop with the community.

Internal: Global Women's Forum in Houston is attended by three Dallas women. External transformation occurs as Dane Adkinson brings over a lawnmower and literally vacuums the yard.

Contradiction: Using non-permeation time to maximum effectiveness and support of Human Development Projects. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Saturday work day on "The Street Where You Live" sees 14 lawns mowed and house painted—bringing the total to eight, 100 more shrubs planted, residence signs with family name and house number and Pace airstrip mowed. Forty-nine adults and fifth and sixth graders travel to New Orleans to be impacted by history of the South through visits to a wax museum and a dramatic trip up the Mississippi on the SS Natchez. Internal: After everyone juggles schedules to work a night shift at a library, the completion of the job is celebrated with inked pizza. House goes to see Jon Elizondo in his school play.

Contradiction: Continuing to fix, refix, refix and refix again every time a pipe bursts. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Alabama is yellow! Troops move from Montgomery across North America to back-up consults. Memphis House receives official red, white and blue document of Resolution 119—House of Representatives endorsement of Town Meeting: Tennessee. Black TMs are real events. Ripley, Tennessee Town Meeting tackles racism issue and stormy meeting ends with blacks and whites exchanging phone numbers with plans to meet again for potluck dinner and planning. Internal: Compilation of data

for Tennessee is a long process because House repeatedly sings the songs, rereads the stories and proposals. House welcomes back McCabe and sends him out with Kelley Michael to Asherton consult, sends Kathy Addington out for summer and Pat Goad to Indianahoma consult. Carol Poole sent to Cincinnati after quickie garage sale unloads junk for \$110 self-support.

Contradiction: Developing rhythm necessary to sustain slim troops to complete the tasks. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Town Meeting in Donaldsonville, Seminole County, with over 60 from the establishment in attendance and \$500 check continues the break-open of Southwest Georgia as the House readies for the massive Georgia push in Quarter IV.

Internal: House spends three days battleplanning for massive Quarter IV push and creates the plan for winning with key state-wide networks, such as Georgia Bankers Association and the County Extension Agents.

Contradiction: Breaking open the entrees that will allow the massive inked and quick-set victories to hold 130 Town Meetings in Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: First task force meeting on Tuesday has 35 persons present. Surveys are begun with excited local participation. Transformation of inked teacherage for staff housing pulls in more volunteers. Unsolicited \$300 check is received in the mail from a major businessman's memorial fund for the first local development sign.

Internal: Truckloads arrive from the Charlotte House to open the new Charlotte House—Gibson HDP. Living in a trailer gives new images of corporate and private space. House Church is held in training center (old school where Project office is housed) and 22 people appear at the sendout of the Bingham family of five to the Jamaican Consult. Redfields appear as ready and willing colleagues formerly involved in Philadelphia.

Contradiction: Engaging community in corporate maneuvers to prepare for the Consult in two weeks. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Xerox prints Florida Summary Report free and United Telephone sends grant of \$300.

Internal: Church gives two weeks paid so staff can go to Gibson Consult.

Contradiction: Knowing what to do and doing it now to be ready for late August. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Area priors arrive for GRA prep. Publishing House receives new computer typesetting equipment, totally revolutionizing the preparation and appearance of printed copy coming from the Nexus. Work continues on decor, inked, spirit life and recruitment for the GRA.

Internal: Nexus sends out the Lazears to ITI: Bahamas and receives infant Sharon Lin Thomas and mother Joy from Taipei. Building refurbishment takes major leap forward with door renovation on residential floors. Evening meals are Nexus events as GRA particulars are hammered out.

Contradiction: Making GRA, camp and summer assignments quickly to mobilize the troops not already at HDP Consults. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Over 20 Fifth Citizens sign up and prepare to travel to consults around the globe. An excellent GWF is held, the key being recruitment.

Internal: Rob Bartlett and Catherine Bundy are sent out to Mill Shoals to become part of the auxilliary.

Contradiction: Moving into Phase II without celebrating Phase I or having a plan. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Letters from towns in response to the question, "What happened after your town meeting?" report that newsletters, grant requests, cleanup days, more town meetings, joining the PRIDE (state community development program), and plans for a festival are in the works.

Internal: Office decor updated with document covers from each Kansas Town Meeting and six-color timeline.

Contradiction: Waiting until the Summer Program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Community becomes engaged in Consult prep through first consult grid and drawing stake design, drawing out housing map. Mayor Hopson and Gene Robertson participate with auxiliary on important authorization and media calls as community forges ahead with park project by clearing another acre and raising park sign over entranceway.

Internal: Daily Office space is prepared just in time for arrival of Beverly and Seamus Enright to work on community park signs and Consult street banner.

Contradiction: Objectifying data and approach to tasks yet to be completed in order to release engagement possibilities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Lorimor Human Development Consult has everyone turned on and going full steam—metro colleagues to put finishing touches on auxiliary accommodations.

Internal: House and Metro celebrate the cluster's school year's end with dinner at Stevenson's Apple Farm.

Contradiction: Maintaining self-support push while sustaining Lorimor Consult dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: As fourth LENS Course ends for the Department of Natural Resources, the largest state department and the third largest landowner in the U.S., 150 staff will have participated in four such courses, for the purpose of learning how to use citizen participation as part of the Department's work and planning.

Internal: House hears report on the four LENS courses from veteran Loudermilk and reflects on the deep necessity to use LENS and other tools to include the established structures around the upcoming HDP town of Kinney, in the creation of the project so that in two years the town will have established the new links with the world that will enable it to continue.

Contradiction: Creating and using the imaginal charts and working decor which hold the accountability and urgency of the task at hand. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: GWF at Babler State Park with 34 women around the table representing St. Louis, East St. Louis, Springfield, Illinois, Kansas City, Missouri and Mill Shoals, Illinois, was a significant bi-state event as all phases were present and strong possibilities for future engagement of women were evident.

Internal: Wrap-up of the GWF day with returning tables to the church, visiting Soulard Market for donations of produce for HDP Consult, returning the borrowed truck, and inking celebration supper and largest mug of beer ever seen, reveals "the wonder of total engagement."

Contradiction: Enabling Mill Shoals HDP. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Local history night generates enthusiasm for Project. Des Moines Register, Iowa's only state-wide newspaper, spends full day taking pictures and talking to people for a "before" story. They will also cover the Consult and follow up on the Project. VISTA contracts arrive for signature.

Internal: John McAdam, Karen Kivimaki and Asher Ertel arrive to bring auxiliary to full strength. Regional work weekend with 20 colleagues transform hotel into residences and offices.

Contradiction: Preparing 800 people for the coming journey into the new world. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Two-pronged workday launches children's playground as pre-consult miracle and builds new stairs to second floor auxiliary House. Residents stop by all day to marvel at the new stairs and Kinney children have to be dragged away from the playground at bedtime.

Internal: Minneapolis House members and colleagues come for workday and Barbara Bellamy and boys make the long trek from Green Bay to complete auxiliary staff.

Contradiction: Making time to do the necessary corporate reflection when nitty gritty tasks seem overwhelming in their demands on time. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDP's along the way.

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDP's right here at home. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Four TM's, including one for CAAP directors from Henry and Hancock counties highlight the week. Federated Church in Lafayette sends ten adults and 23 youth to Inyan Wakagapi for a week's work project. Jeanne Wilson does second report to 20 women who can set up GWF in Indiana.

Internal: Indiana Gold Rush celebration, hosted by King Mida and the Golden Girl, includes treasure hunt, golden buffet, gold medal awards, the golden age of comedy and a new song, Golden Indiana. Ruth Landmann is sent out to Chile and Guatemala consults. Jeanne and Kenyon Wilson announce their decision to begin intern year mid-June.

Contradiction: Picking up an additional twelve counties with tactical grace. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CONCINNATI

External: Great Kentucky Cotillion is finished in grand style—all 120 counties are GOLDEN.

Internal: Cotillion celebration with colleagues, with sendout of Jim Armour to the Widen Consult and Shirley St. John to the Alabama Campaign.

Contradiction: Gathering all loose ends in order to focus on the summer. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Held training event for Town Meetings in urban saturation community, involving Michigan Bell community relations staff as volunteer workshop leaders; set up Town Meeting in Michigan's last county for June 8; hosted GWF, CYF, and LENS teams to set up forums as part of saturation.

Internal: Colleague Lois Martin brings acquaintance Gayle Thompson to house, who is interested in doing something with her life. Made call to London to ask to spend at least a year in HDP there or Wales.

Contradiction: Playing the trump we have. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Quarterly planning in our five major program arenas was done by creating timelines and maneuver worksheets.

Internal: Cleveland and Cincinnati celebrate Easter with an Easter trek, quarterly planning and a fine Easter dinner.

Contradiction: Gearing up for Quarter IV in the midst of accelerated program actuation and troop disbursement. (Wk. 1)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Over 100 potential GRA participants are phoned and invited to a metro briefing on June 10 for celebration of the year and context for GRA summer participation and movement activity. To date, 27 say yes to the briefing and five out of 100 say yes to GRA. Image: 15 from the region.

Internal: Rite of passage celebration honors the three university grads in the House: Nan Bailey, Ruth Walker and Brian May, and allows articulation of gifts of areas of training to present sociological situation.

Contradiction: Focusing Quarter I images to release regional momentum. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House finally completes a select Town Meeting mailing list to enable continued contact with key participants, advocates and development sources.

Internal: Evening work session is a sign of sustained corporate effort which gets the job done.

Contradiction: Generating momentum for participation of the servant force. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Push on in-kind for HDP while completing invitations for HDP consult recruitment.

Internal: Alice Rose qualifies for city track, and having the Youth Cluster Evaluation completed creates a great impact on the House.

Contradiction: Consults coming up fast, and we are only at the starting gate. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Two more Town Meetings are set for Isle of Wight county saturation.

Internal: House celebrates with Ivy City at House Church.

Contradiction: Quickly firming up commitments that have been made and expanding the GSF base. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON—IVY CITY HDP

External: Long term projects are brought to a head this week as preschool cots are completed, thrift shop is overhauled and second annual Job Fair is held.

Internal: Shift to summer is symbolized by refreshing Jet into July collegiums. The kitchen is sprayed and completely reordered.

Contradiction: Getting jump on summer program and long-range planning while celebrating a wedding. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Community of Starks takes opportunity to begin again actualizing its care as clean-up assistance (led by elders), gifts (trout and fiddleheads), shared stake visiting and press interviewing build relationships with ICA auxiliary.

Internal: Move in with help of colleagues from three states makes 150-year-old farm house livable to amazement of local people.

Contradiction: Eventful calendar, practical assignments. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: County Saturation in Windham County, Connecticut is complete with five Town Meetings during the week. Five consultants are ready to attend HDP consults next week.

Internal: House travels to Maine for work day. Tim Karpoff completes first week on new job and flies to Denver for a week of training.

Contradiction: Developing committed colleagues to accomplish victories in development, in-kind, and enablement for the Human Development Consults and Projects. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER — CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Residents push first week actualization of training, information center and community decision-making programs as they attend Rural Leadership Conference and plan to attend alternative energy fair; assume responsibility for writing and delivering newsletter, and hold Valley Meeting with 20 in attendance.

Internal: Evening of building internal life models brings sustaining order.

Contradiction: Creating boldly visible signs of new life. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House sees double as it focuses simultaneously on enabling Starks HDP and "Windham Whammo" County Saturation in Connecticut with five Town Meetings this week. Consultants, enablers, and visitors are sent off to Starks Consult at evening slide show and briefing.

Internal: Campaign Night activities consist of metro colleagues taking full responsibility for orchestrating the Killingly, Ct. Town Meeting.

Contradiction: Attaining use of wheels to take in-kind materials and people to the Starks Consult. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: The area gathered at Lorne de L'Acadie HDP to build a new consensus for June mission. The area celebrates the completion of CFCs in the Atlantic provinces with "Lobster Boil", 100 lobsters.

Internal: Area youth and Emerging Generation arrive at the Area House for a week of study of the Creation Story, including a trip to the aquarium at "La Ronde" and a cook-out at the beach.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity on on-going saturation tasks to bolster troop morale. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of house is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Inkind nets new Gestetner, refrigerator, 500 reams of paper, kitchen supplies and whole cow for HDTS. Faculty works on HDTS adaptation. Foro Comunitario in Maracaibo for Rotary youth is a great success.

Internal: Staff sends out Paul Calhoun to the Academy and celebrates with village the ending of the week of CHA.

Contradiction: Expanding funding base for HDTS and Continental expansion. (Wk. 2)
