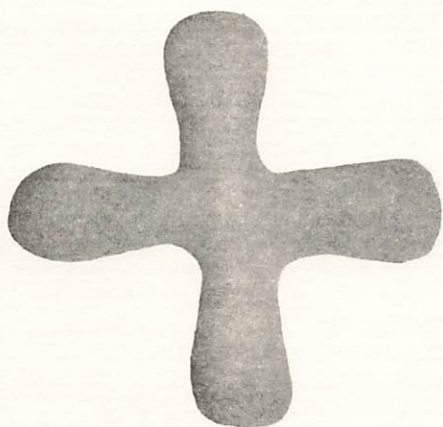

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON - ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: House meets with representatives from 14 island groups at the joint invitation of ICA/AIC (Association of Island Communities) and sets date for holding a CIF on the use of \$40,000 building donated to the island through the ICA - the largest gathering of representatives with AIC groups since the beginning of the project. Power House renovation begins with ICA office in the building. Intensive calling on regional colleagues gets grassroots pledges and invites participation in TM England in the spring.

Internal: Christine Mead, Oxford student who spent some time in Malwada, decides to sojourn for eight weeks.

Contradiction: Keeping up the momentum while standing back for councils. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Elmvale TM, a great event in Glasgow inner city, reveals the determination of local residents to carry on.

Internal: Dianne Greenwald joins Tartan Swirl Patrols for a week during School holiday and takes away insights for England county coverage.

Contradiction: Maintaining the towns with dates set in Tayside while moving out into the entire geography of seven regions (counties). (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Continental team names HDP site, located in a mining community in South Wales.

Internal: The Farleys, an Intermediate Technology Group family, who helped set up the brick factory in El Bayad, drop by the house to announce their interest in participating in Wales Consult and other ICA programs.

Contradiction: Securing local motivation to do Consults in the selected community in just six weeks. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Last summer's youth participation in GSD Projects leads to two more unsolicited requests for summer Project

Internal: Continued areal demands cut close to the bone as House presence for the week is one adult and four Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Marrying all that is going on in the area to TM England prep, while making sure all that is going on keeps going on. (Wk. 8)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two Forum Communautaires are held this week in two new regions - Franche-Comte and Bourgogne, which are now colored yellow. A third GCF is set up for next week in a third new region.

Internal: House sends Penny Portman to Berlin to join the economic acceleration trek and begins teaching an English class which doubles the weekly English teaching income.

Contradiction: Accelerating Development to correspond with the demand of the external tasks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME - TERMINE HDP

External: The quarterly assembly, highlighted by serious guild workshops, begins a week of working visits by three Guardians in the key areas of agriculture and physical appearance.

Internal: Participation of Carol and Jean Fleischman and Phil Holmes in the Project is a great event for both village and auxiliary.

Contradiction: Creating the focus of doing that will hold the tension between activating a rapid visible demonstration and motivating local commitment. (Wk. 8)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS - IJEDE HDP

External: Local chief, who is an electrical contractor, directs team of twenty Ijedians to install street light system. Signal

lights come on. Floor of generator house for street lights plants is laid. One hundred bags of inkind cement arrive.

Internal: The year 1978 arrives with New Year's Eve celebration and New Year's day spent at the beach.

Contradiction: Winding up details while organizing new thrust for the future. (Wk. 8)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Concentrated Development push along with major inkind maneuver promise exciting breakthroughs.

Internal: Report on India framing swirls spirits as well as missional images.

Contradiction: Prioritizing tasks so that Continental Council preparation is done effectively without overriding the 1000 other tasks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Top advisor of Ministry of Culture declares Dorpsdag exemplary for all Flanders. The next round of workbooks will be printed free. Three Town Meetings are held and a 19-year-old workshop leader trains others to lead.

Internal: Report on India framing swirls spirits as well as missional images.

Contradiction: Creating sophisticated campaign machinery. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Responding to a call for a presentation on the ICA from the Rotary's women, the Innerwheel in Hoorne, opens up a new network for women's participation in GWF and GSD Consults and brings in a little program fee. First Town Meeting in the Netherlands is scheduled for March 14 in Baarle-Naasau.

Internal: House discovers what concrete options are in the search for free or subsidized facility.

Contradiction: Moving ahead to create advantages out of the continental events already scheduled while maintaining credibility in the midst of last minute cancellations of appointments due to vehicle breakdown. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Advocacy of the head of the Evangelical Academy in Bochum helps set up two more TMs in the Ruhr Valley, bringing the total to ten in the next three weeks and the goal of 12 within sight.

Internal: Friends of the House gather to view the India slide show immediately after it is reduplicated for continental use.

Contradiction: Tying the Ruhr Valley package together with adequate framing, authorization and funding to ensure broad impact on the Ruhr and beyond. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The mayor of Kreuzberg escorts cultural attache from the Bonn government around the Project, ending their tour in the Cafe zur Laterne. The man who owns the business on the corner of the last U Bahn stop, bored one day, decides to take a walk around the block for the first time in many years, running into the parks, Centrum with posters of different programs and the cafe. Coincidentally, he is visited the next day about putting a mural on his big three-story wall so hat all who ride the U Bahn can see it. His reply is, "Of course, I knew something new was happening in this neighborhood."

Internal: The newborn grandson of Priscilla and Rod Wilson, weighing in at 4.4 kilos (10 lbs.) is shown off to Kreuzberg the very day his parents, Tina and Ben Wilson, bring him home.

Contradiction: Claiming the victory to be shared by all. (Wk. 8)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: As heavy rains make passage into Kapini HDP impassable, two truck tippers, a front end loader, road grader and 168 feet of fortified construction pipe are donated for Week II assault to gain road access before the Consult. The 150-foot holding wall built by villagers to save land bridge crumbles into 20 foot gorge. The bridge still stands. Inkind blitz of 50 calls in two days nets tents to dish soap for the Consult. District Governor welcomes KHDP to his district and asks for 40 invitations to the Consult. Member of the Central Committee says KHDP will be a model village for the province and agrees to give the opening Consult address.

Internal: Three weeks in a week time design and late buffet dinners intensify Consult drive.

Contradiction: Slashing, stumping, well digging and tenting in the midst of continuous rains. (Wk. 9)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad Trade Fair draws 50 visitors from Cairo, including British ambassador's wife and adding to 100 Jesuit school students already in Bayad for three days of work and 16 architecture students who do sketches of future plaza. Highly profitable marmalade industry makes first sales. Seventy-five ail drims plus transport and wood for fish farm is inkinded, as well as four cages are prepared for floating in ethe Nile. Beautiful brick samples are taken by village employee for testing. Experimental plot in the desert is irrigated and planted. Bayad market opens. Guest flat is inkinded in Ca iro. GCF Egypt is launched with great demonstration village visit in Bayad.

Internal: Global Wedge team visits and spins House into practical grasp of maneuvering with overfilled table at every meal, including strong village presence with three new interns.

Contradiction: Creating the structural forms to allow Project acceleration to continue. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Village Meeting is held in Naruh. Government officials stay all day and work as team leaders instead of attending a wedding. Over 150 Masai show up. The demonstration pig sets style as she gives birth to 14 piglets. Minister of Works formally invites ICA to do a Human Development Project in western province.

Internal: House sends out Consult team to Kapini, Zambia.

Contradiction: Picking up on the momentum of the Consult without settling into a normal pattern of operation. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party,

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP)
to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige) married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Four companies submit their applications for 100% tax deduction for their financial commitment in NGP. Patanwalla Company donates 1500 bars of soap.

Internal: House hosts two nurses from Amsterdam, Laxdals from Minneapolis and John Patterson's Aunt Margaret, who visits Bombay and Maliwada.

Contradiction: Using House nucleus to catalyze external forces for the engagement on every missional front (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons ink kind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to ink kind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, ink kind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wadegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP

External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP)

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP

External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Ga ngapur Taluka donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Jane Coe helps GWF bulk recruitment. Village site selection locates a village which meets all requirements: proximity, size, poverty, access. Marie Paul returns after leading a series of GWFs in Maharashtra.

Internal: House intensifies to prepare for intensified mission.

Contradiction: Raising monies for global travel with the focus on village site selection. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: The village digs drains and does cleanup in anticipation of the visit of Mr. Atal, Chairman of VST, the funding agent. Septic tanks are dug; playground and sentry tower are completed; welcome banners and signs are made; and the staff house is built to the roof level.

Internal: All auxiliary get new blue shirts.

Contradiction: Maintaining consistent corporate structures when up to one half of the staff are on assignment out of the village. (Wk. 9)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House sends first trek from Kuala Lumpur to Penang and Taiping as indicated by GCF battleplan for Malaysia.

Internal: Dinner conversations and Week II conversations highlight week.

Contradiction: Moving from protracted campaign to maneuver mindset. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: GCF task force does back-up and planning for major campaign in Southeast Asia. Sarawak State Development officer submits HDP proposal to deputy state secretary.

Internal: Quarterly battleplanning is completed as Sungai Aup House meets together for first time since September.

Contradiction: Moving with precision while clouded by ambiguity about future location and field of engagement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Guardian dynamic emerges loud and clear when technical problems preventing official ICA general meeting become a witnessing session as American businessman colleague says, "Let's get on with Sungai Lui. You handle the legal stuff however you like." Mohammed Shah agrees to be chairman of governing board, putting his family expertise in auditing and familiarity with legal and government procedures at ICA's disposal. Malaysia TM, called Majlis Tetangga, is held in Sungai Lui following a week of late-hour training. Sungai Lui people are ready to go.

Internal: John Cock visits to help in legal issues and Kim Thornton is welcomed for extended Development stay.

Contradiction: Keeping visible signs coming in Sungai Lui amidst enticement of GCF, Development and long-range programs not so visible. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: The first clean water public washing, bathing, and toilet facilities is completed with inkind labor and village labor-8 more to go!

Internal: Soehardi returns from CTC in Australia excited about doing GCF in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Focusing midquarter the weak points in the Physical Vitality Task Force in order to create one thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness.

Contradiction: Waiting for concrete data before building an implementable battleplan. (Wk. 8)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development treks visit Tokyo and Seoul. Tony Elizondo reports with photos on Langub HDP Consult and implementation.

Internal: In the midst of catching up on back work, Nexus House enjoys three-day Chinese New Year holiday by watching a Lion Dance on the street where we live.

Contradiction: Discerning the lines of responsibility for follow through among the bands, the Nexus and the local areas to enable missional effectiveness. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: The Sheraton Hotel agrees to host Guardian's meeting and invitations are sent. Hong Kong Roundtable

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP)
visits Nam Wai and decides to repair village drains as the club project. Fund raising drive in village is initiated to acquire materials necessary to complete football pitch. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company gives IBM electric typewriter to Project. Car is donated for one month to transport village workers for training in electronic assembly and facility in Nam Wai is painted and ready to begin operation as soon as training is finished. Large wall near entrance to village is painted in preparation for second village mural. Parents hold first P.T.A. meeting. Development nets HK\$2000 from International Credit Alliance and HK\$500 from Avon Cosmetics.

Internal: Clare Bonnell goes to Taiwan for GWF staff and House is impacted by Ghandi study on village development written as far back as 1919.

Contradiction: Putting lives behind developing a community cadre to provide teamwork and a focus on corporate needs. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: A great GWF is held in Kaohsiung with 50 participants--prominent Chinese and AMerican women--which promises to provide needed private sector support for the Project.

Internal: Clare Bonnell visits Project following GCF bringing reports and gifts from Nam Wai.

Contradiction: Acquiring effective clout to move major Project maneuvers down the road. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Two-thirds of next month's Development goal is in-hand with two days to go in February. US AID gives favorable first review of Langub HDP proposal.

Internal: House enjoys weekend retreat at Guardian's beach resort.

Contradiction: Finding the new level of Development prospects to ensure continued momentum beyond victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development task force accounts for US\$1,750 in hand by the end of Week 7.

Internal: ICA staff leaves for many assignments: Katherine Cheng to HDTS in Korea, Chinese and American staff to GWF in Kaohsiung.

Contradiction: Putting structure and timelines on the ten key arenas of activity projected for Quarter IV in the Taipei Region. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Guardians Luncheon hosts 30 key persons, including members of top two families of Philippines, who also visited Sudtonggan and are considering underwriting Langub Project. Eighteen students from two universities spend weekend working on purok beautification and their proposal for ten to spend summer month (April) is accepted. Agricultural guild 'dresses' first 200 chickens. The last kilometer of wire is installed to end of Purok Five, which means whole village can be electrified. Two health care-takers graduate from Regional Health Lab as medical technicians for sputum and stool exams. A Lions Club approves a proposal to support one Early Learning Center class at 450 pesos a month for one year.

Internal: The arrival of Lester Knutsen from Development Trek for a short four-day interim prompts House celebration as he reports of Development success across the Philippines.

Contradiction: Deciding where to win, no longer how or if. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO-LANGUB HDP

External: First all-Langub Sports Day draws participation from all five sitios (stakes) and culminates with a community dance. New Paglilingkod Bangong Lipunan (rural service workers) group arrives, repairs the collapsed toilet, puts new rain gutters on the school, and begins building the cement block wall for the school. Community Life Guild constructs Barangay post office box and sitio signs. The Food Nutrition Program arrives from Red Cross and City Health. Valentine's Day Dance is held with proceeds going to the Day-Care Center. Agriculture guild registers animals for insemination. Development continues with site visits from Granexport and Cummins Diesel.

Internal: Collegium of writing miracle stories releases wonder. Ecclesiola evening of relooking at the dynamics of ecclesiola and planning the ecclesiola format for the rest of the quarter regrounds symbolic life.

Contradiction: Pushing through immediate events to the long-range. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: A planning meeting is held for the International Town Meeting of Tokyo.

Internal: Joseph Kim from the Jeju Do Human Development Training School and M. Emura from the Oyubari Human Development Project return to sojourn in the Tokyo House.

Contradiction: Timelining myriad detail to deal with seven weeks of one program on top of another. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Promises of financial support for village housing and common piggery are made by the island government. Two village women, HDTS cooks, are impacted by the urban trip to Pusan with the Training School.

Internal: House does mid-quarter battleplanning to regain village momentum. House cleaning and corporate work on permeators models is done during Week II.

Contradiction: Beginning shadow leadership program to spur HDP momentum. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House establishes relationship with Korean Oil Corporation relative to future funding and support and enables HDTS urban trek to Pusan.

Internal: House welcomes Jim Oberg for two-week Development trek.

Contradiction: Holding to the pillars of corporateness while experiencing radical dispersion in establishing a new Project. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU 2 RI-KUH DU 2 RI HDP

External: Task forces set up and host Pusan urban trip for HDTS, meet with HDTS faculty for Consult planning, visit the Asia Foundation for Consult funding, meet Deputy Prime Minister Nam Duck Woo at a dinner, visit Kuh Du 2 Ri to plan the Consult with two village leaders, travel to Choongju for TM, send Cheng Mai Jun from Hai Ou to Kwangyung Il for HDTS and reschedule Kuh Du 2 Ri Consult for a April 23-29 with full village and government support.

Internal: House holds signal workshop on Consult task force work and assignments and picks up part-time teaching job teaching Korean language to Vice President of Bechtel International Construction and Engineering Company, now residing in Seoul.

Contradiction: Using the next two months intensely to expand HDP in Seoul Region through national maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Staff comes from Osaka and local lady from Yoshizuka parish volunteers to help teach Naha (Okinawa) in three Global Women's Forums in one week.

Internal: Guilders come from local university club to train to do Chiki Kon Dankai calling in historic site of Dazaifu as Fukuoka blitz begins.

Contradiction: Training fresh troops. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: House engages in Development week with 32 calls, including Toyota in Nagoya, for possible funding and \$11,000 working while at the same time two regional staff pick up on the GWF task and go to Fukuoka and Okinawa for three GWFs in Japanese language.

Internal: House and Development team of Oberg and Ferguson devise orchestrated task forces of Music Man, Siren Song and Drum Beat with daily celebrations.

Contradiction: Building colleague consensus on Town Meeting thrust for next quarter. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Two Chiiki Kon Dankais, one in Urasu City with 70 members of the Rojinkai elders association and one in Oyubari, are held as initial GCFs in the Hokkaido 40 Maneuver.

Internal: The House is thoroughly cleaned and the floors completely waxed, anticipating the arrival of spring.

Contradiction: Gapping the tension between time and troops. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Guardian core visits Murrin Bridge, checks out needs and returns with 20 tons of cement. Newcastle Guardians pick up responsibility for first HDTs package.

Internal: Half of Walkabout team returns nine tires later after 23,000 kilometers trek with 30 Community Meetings held.

Contradiction: Bringing the clarity of mission through own organization which allows the practical engagement of those who respond to the call. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: CMA is held at Melville High School with 1,250. Site is found for GWF, with 30 signed up. State committee member sends a proposal to the premier for CMA: Western Australia funding and gets a response from the treasury the next week.

Internal: Youth do indicative battleplanning in preparation for trip to Oombulgurri and revolutionary engagement here.

Contradiction: Actualizing and implementing models with knife edge sharpness to break loose key arenas, particularly state campaign funding. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Week of final completion Corroborree preparation breaks loose in kind in all shapes and sizes in Darwin. Donor circuit picks up \$1,000 in first call and finds consultants ready and willing for new Project. Five from Darwin attend Oombulgurri completion Corroborree.

Internal: After hosting Yallops on Corroborree preparation and donor circuit, White, Betonte, Norton, Yallops and four colleagues flying back from Oombulgurri are forced to land and are stranded at Port Keats Mission overnight showing radical contrast to Oombulgurri HDP.

Contradiction: Handling priority tasks in the midst of enforced waiting. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: School begins on time with full attendance of all ages from a two-week old infant to 12 year old. With the opening of school, the community kitchen starts with a team of five adults. The adult education center begins to engage adults in evening activities.

Internal: The community welcomes the return of Julie Miesen and her husband, John. House assignments are presented to symbolize a new start for the second phase of Oombulgurri's development.

Contradiction: Building the forms and patterns to dramatize the completed nature of the community. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: "Walkabout Channellers - South Australia" do six aboriginal Community Meetings in seven days, reaching 15% of the people in those communities. Murrin Bridge Consultation recruitment begins with four decisions.

Internal: Guest night (one guest, a community health nurse with experience in the Yemen) reviews Walkabout trek and views Oombulgurri completion slides.

Contradiction: Continuing the intensification of colleague engagement in and beyond the three campaigns. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Melbourne Region participates in three-ring circus as Walkabout team reaches four aboriginal communities culminating in great CMA at Lake Tyres, as the first GWF is held in Australia and as GWF team visits wife of the mayor of Melbourne. Sam Umbagai leads in the celebration of the completed life of his colleague and iron man of Mowanjum, Albert Wangelou.

Internal: Rebecca Banks is sent out to youth cluster in Adelaide. Garnet returns from Oombulgurri Completion Corroborree and John is sent to Singapore to work on GCF launch.

Contradiction: Convincing experts that their common sense and capacity to work with the people at Murrin Bridge is needed as well as their expertise. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Twenty-four are confirmed for Guardians' night dinner. GWF speaking engagements with key women's groups, production of a GWF brochure, press release and a financing model enliven House activities.

Internal: Anne Yallop arrives to speak with Premier's wife. John Rader gets a job with a book company.

Contradiction: Creating ways to journey consultants and close colleagues toward Project participation. (Wk. 9)

External: Staff holds a Town Meeting with the Arizona Department of Education which breaks open consulting self-support.

Internal: House spends the day soaking up the sun at Canyon Lake for Saturday discontinuity.

Contradiction: Keeping various tasks on track. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Manila, Utah TM is orchestrated by Guardians. Thursday night slide show at Guardian's home kicks off inkind blitz for the Inyan Wakagapi HDP

Internal: Unexpected visit by mayor of scheduled TM site puts House to the test.

Contradiction: Deciding that this is the way it is going to get done. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Mailing goes out to colleagues. Margaret and Carl Ennis and George Emerick inform the House from Idaho of coming TMs.

Internal: Late night ecclesiola is held after a fine meal made by the youth.

Contradiction: Making the most of the given situation. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Metro colleagues are engaged in extensive evening task force planning as recruitment and task layout proceed with full force on GWF.

Internal: Inventive Saturday night celebration sets new standards without money.

Manager at Hughes asks casually, "Oh, by the way, can you do a Town Meeting for 5,000 people? We want all of our employees to participate."

Internal: Dana Dirickson lands a job with legal firm downtown and Claire Taylor writes intriguing resume.

Contradiction: Setting up North and Central Texas maneuvers while at the same time mopping up South and West Texas counties. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Over 100 folks announce that the future is now in Southland Town Meeting.

Internal: Metro colleague leads "Divine Mileau" study in ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Envisioning the next leap beyond the current experience of dread. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Lone Star Stampede enters third week of circuits in the six-week maneuver with 14 dates set on southern front.

Internal: Tom and Connie Greyslock arrive from Lorne to pick up new assignment. San Antonio business community continues to make maneuver planning and debriefing Week IIs great events at mealtimes.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Cooperative Development effort opens doors to Roman Catholic Orders, new adopt-a-village churches, Chamber of Commerce access to key corporate and religious leadership and Guardian and patron involvement, while contacts begin in 20 counties for two TM assemblies.

Internal: House and Development team celebrate victory at local pub where House is regaled with stories of sea cucumbers, shark fishing, and other adventures of HDP formulation.

Contradiction: Building victory stories that embody reality and disclose future possibility. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in the face of a shift in troops strength while turning toward Kansas. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: House hosts Dabhad dinner to celebrate Minnesota's adopted village with 26 guests, with before and after slides of Maliwada.

Internal: Campaign unity of Global Servant Force impacts as circuiters join with Rapid City colleagues in South Dakota after six weeks of corporately setting up state campaign.

Contradiction: Adjusting calendar so global priorities do not fall away. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

Contradiction: Drawing together the logistical support. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Three TMs are held. Len Hockley opens authorization and Development doors by visiting old family friends. Three teams grid an area of Detroit in preparation for Town Meetings.

Internal: Moving on self-support thorough search for job, grant, and a new facility happens in one week.

Contradiction: Catalyzing troop engagement in all areas, regionally and continentally. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Comprehensive plan is completed for Kentucky Appalachian Advance with initial Town Meetings set up and mailing materials on their way.

Internal: Ann Eberhard is sent out for a week to orchestrate French Community Forums in Quebec.

Contradiction: Actuating final reluctant counties while moving forward on other fronts. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Doing the five things that need to be done day by day to assure three dates set by the end of the week. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Nine House members, along with three colleagues, travel to Ivy City for continental workday and division meetings.

Internal: "Blessings" happen when water pipe bursts one day before the major snowstorm.

Contradiction: Pushing aside the excuses of no way to get there. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: First ever Town Meeting Assembly is held in Virginia at Fredericksburg with communities exchanging ideas, models, and proposals.

Internal: Inkind for eight at Rustler Steak House caps Development week that sees \$1175 cash in hand raised.

Contradiction: Striking quickly and accurately to complete Virginia by March 18, 1978. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: Engagement is key to Week II as 33 women find a new female collegiality during Global Womens Forum and metro colleagues participate in a housing PSU and in a marketing meeting for the regional GWF.

Internal: Ivy City hosts Delta Pace and Area Houston representatives and is excited by slide show and reports in collegium.

Contradiction: Holding ongoing programs and preparation for future events in tension with visible weekly wins. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: GCF scores victories in the form of the Maryland State Assembly and the Cambridge, Maryland Black community Town Meeting, moving toward the completion of Maryland.

Internal: Collegiums and Day II time involving the GSF focuses on creation of the Grand Maryland Development Maneuver.

Contradiction: Discovering how to enable fine TMs in the remaining counties in Maryland while doing the first major combined House, metro and bastion push on Development. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: House Emerging Generation goes to birthday party and discovers that friend's grandfather is a pastor of a church. He invites the ICA to speak the next Sunday on Adopt a Village.

Internal: Just a few phone calls and worship pennies enable \$200 to be sent to Development.

Contradiction: Releasing people to adopt Mangrul. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Development is the focus of week in which collegium, a workshop training session, appointments with new leads and religious orders, and an HDP inkind workshop allow variety of opportunities for training and practical experience in winning as developers.

Internal: Area strike force joins House for debriefing/celebrative dinner where field and area eventfulness is shared and implications for the future are discerned.

Contradiction: Utilizing broader learnings to operate in a rhythm and design that claims decisive victories. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Long Island GWF facility site is confirmed for March 31 with host committee of 10 picking up recruitment task.

Internal: House holds Development Day starting with collegium and ending with evening workshop on "Appointment Mailing."

Internal: Telephone set-up game Tuesday and Thursday evening is great training event for House and metro. Collegium on inkind for HDP Consults raises the seriousness of the task.

Contradiction: Ensuring staff is on hand to care for bringing off impact courses scheduled for next week. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Boston's snowstorm of the century releases entire House to a full week of Day I time, resulting in over 30 women committed to attend the GWF by massive phoning blitz done on Campaign Night.

Internal: The House, confined for a full week due to blizzard, barely escapes cabin fever by trudging out to a fine movie, "Turning Point."

Contradiction: Releasing the clog-up of printing deliveries while dealing with cancelled appointments and transportation difficulties caused by the snowstorm. (Wk. 7)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Eight people come from four corners of continent to aid in orchestration of French Forums, bringing total to 32 in Quebec while area service corps speed madly across 4,200 miles to ensure an encounter between east and west.

Internal: Saturday night celebration for returning circuiters includes Penina Elbez providing a Moroccan feast, Sherene James, with newly acquired visa in hand, performing a

Indian dance and three local belles doing a top-notch belly dance.

Contradiction: Allowing data to inform the body and to push through good ideas to corporate consensus. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five districts in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of House is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Area visioning session on Sunday afternoon in Montreal injects breadth and confidence in midst of intensive campaign activity.

Internal: House celebrates new gracious presence of House created by a week of cleaning and decorating of space by Emerging Generation and adults.

Contradiction: Moving like a butterfly and stinging like a bee, i.e., keeping flexible, quick and offensive in campaigning. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: This was fire protection week, including a banquet for the fire fighters, the official opening fo the firehall, attended by the fire marshall of New Brunswick, a fire prevention exposition and house-to-house calls by the firefighters and health visitors. New Cano Negro team member gives powerful half-hour report on the Foro and the need to have more workshop leaders from the village. Women's Week in the village opens with Women's Foro and ends with a miracle day featuring a tea and reflection on the week. Guilds prepare practical presentations and workshops in stakes ranging from plaza design workshops to first aid classes and "A Day at the Preschool." Stakes bubble over with new curriculum. Agricultural Guild transplants 2,000 papaya trees for commercial garden.

Internal: Jim Kelly arrives to head up development efforts for Latin American expansion and the HDTs. House reworks maneuvers after expansion team leaves to integrate HDTs maneuvers with completion timeline.

Contradiction: Breaking through routine in village to announce the home stretch of completion. (Wk. 7)

Global Development Centrum reports a \$500,000 week highlighted by grants from ITT, Belgium, Canada and the Chartered Bank of Hong Kong. Brussels reports another \$500,000 in working proposals. Singapore reports signing USAID agreement in Jakarta. A new area of funding is opening up with the initiation of the USA 12 HDP story. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building the motivation that works all contacts, both corporate and individual.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports responses to Week II conversations flow in to activate again the Research net and reveal the global impact of all revolutions. HDTS dates are set for Combulgurti in April and Australian Education department agrees to fund aboriginal participants. Work on Quarter IV ecclesia manual sparks analysis of real issues confronting the Order both internally and externally and pushes for ways of dealing with them locally. Effectivity is revealed in maneuvers of producing the CVE brochure in Chicago and second annual PCE document in Manila. The contradiction lies in creating the images that hold unity while allowing all to be relevant to the edges on all fronts.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Community Forum is being accelerated around the globe with a Malaysian battleplan completed and actuated and eight TMs in Europe covering every operating area of that continent. Two acceleration tracks are initiated in Delta Pace and Kreuzberg Ost. In Chicago, a continental PSU with area priors, Project directors and Nexus representatives created the plans for doing the USA 12 expansion, county completion, saturation demonstrations and self-support victories in Quarter IV. Simplified GCF setup and transitional phasing have allowed acceleration of the three campaigns simultaneously. The contradiction lies in the arena of positioning the forces to get the job done in Quarter IV and also create the advantage for next year.

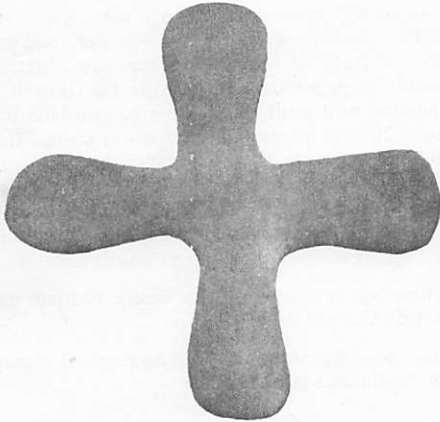
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Dianne Greenwald joins Tartan Swirl Patrols for a week during School holiday and takes away insights for England county coverage.

Contradiction: Maintaining the towns with dates set in Tayside while moving out into the entire geography of seven regions (counties). (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Continental team names HDP site, located in a mining community in South Wales.

Internal: The Farleys, an Intermediate Technology Group family who helped set up the brick factory in El Bayad, drop by the House to announce their interest in participating in Wales Consult and other ICA programs.

Contradiction: Securing local motivation to do Consults in the selected community in just six weeks. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Fifty-five colleagues in England are visited as part of the research for Town Meeting: England. Twenty are planning to participate in regional council Saturday.

Internal: Colleagues ring House offering to care for Emerging Generation as their way to participate in Town Meeting: England.

External: Two Forum Communautaires are held this week in two new regions, Franche-Comte and Bourgogne, which are now colored yellow. A third GCF is set up for next week in a third new region.

Internal: House sends Penny Portman to Berlin to join the economic acceleration trek and begins teaching an English class which doubles the weekly English teaching income.

Contradiction: Accelerating Development to correspond with the demand of the external tasks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: Terminese are leaving the village. Some are going on calls for TM information meetings and a salesman is on the road selling Casa Pancas.

Internal: House resettles and makes room for six more - five from France for the training school and one from Boston to participate in the HDP - giving 21 around the table.

Contradiction: Creating a hard plan to release the explosive abundance facing all in the campaigns. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: First metro meeting in Onitsha (Enugu region) is covered by circuit which also holds first TM steering committee meeting in that region. Formal meeting of Nigerian Institute of Cultural Affairs is held to enable legal registration. Heavy emphasis on training pushes journey of coordinators. The village entry way is completed, and large 25' X 10' sign is donated by Afromedia, complete with art work. Workday cleans out and paints new meeting spaces in community for guilds.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

Internal: Charles Ola Sanlola begins internship. Collegium room is repainted and decorated, while back yard is transformed.

Contradiction: Arranging for critical resources which are available to release Project visibility. (Wk. 10)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Concentrated Development push along with major inkind maneuver promise exciting breakthroughs.

Internal: Report on India framing swirls spirits as well as missional images.

Contradiction: Prioritizing tasks so that Continental Council preparation is done effectively without overriding the 1000 other tasks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Set-up meetings are scheduled in two more provinces. Four TMs held in Limberg raise up new workshop leaders and orchestrators.

Internal: A week of full employment begins to handle self-support.

Contradiction: Stretching one circuit team to do twice as much work. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: North Holland circuit yields two provinces preparing for Dorpsdag. Rotary and Rotary wives' clubs ready to receive proposals of \$100 to \$4,000 and major introductory authorization letter from Rotary to a all Dutch chapters.

Internal: Tillich study at ecclesiola gives opportunity to think through Town Meeting as revelatory experience.

Contradiction: Building the tactical implementation system which allows all troops to do required maneuver follow-up. (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: First two of the Ruhr Valley GCFs, Wesel-Feldmark with 100 and Oberhausen-Buschhausen with 250 present, are great happenings. Two more GCFs are set in Bochum and Bottrop, raising the total to 12. College of Social Pedagogy in Kaiserswerth starts second seminar on Town Meeting in April with the training of students for workshop leading and orchestrating.

Internal: Kenneth Keller from Green Bay stops by on his way to Kapini and Joanne Wilson volunteers to work in the office for a day.

Contradiction: Training local workshop leaders for three full-day GCFs this weekend and shifting gears to do the workshops in the first two evening GCFs in Germany, also this weekend. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Visibility is all over the place with the new lighted sign on the Centrum. The economic acceleration team leads in creating and executing five grand maneuvers with the results of the week being the selection of a Community Center location. Both public and private sources have been seen for funding already. The Centrum showcases have five new displays highlighting programs. The ongoing weekly events calendar in both German and Turkish was distributed to businesses and placed in windows. Dorle wins with inkind for the children's program. Entry hall of 83 gets thoroughly cleaned and interestingly decorated. Saturday afternoon guitar player increases business in the cafe by 25%, keeping new employee hopping. Architect and city official accidentally

meet in the cafe and discuss next steps for housing renovation.

Internal: Maria and Wolf Dieter take Regina to West Germany to help in orchestrating four Town Meetings in one weekend.

Contradiction: Finding a way to mobilize troops after the momentum has been created. (Wk. 10)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: As heavy rains make passage into Kapini HDP impassable, two truck tippers, a front end loader, road grader and 168 feet of fortified construction pipe are donated for Week II assault to gain road access before the Consult. The 150 foot holding wall built by villagers to save land bridge crumbles into 20 foot gorge. The bridge still stands. Inkind blitz of 50 calls in two days nets tents to dish soap for the Consult. District Governor welcomes KHDP to his district and asks for 40 invitations to the Consult. Member of the Central Committee says KHDP will be a model village for the province and agrees to give the opening Consult address.

Internal: Three weeks in a week time design and late buffet dinners intensify Consult drive.

Contradiction: Slashing, stumping, well digging and tenting in the midst of continuous rains. (Wk. 9)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Bayad Trade Fair draws 50 visitors from Cairo, including British ambassador's wife and adding to 100 Jesuit school students already in Bayad for three days of work and 16 architecture students who do sketches of future plaza. Highly profitable marmalade industry makes first sales. Seventy-five oil drums plus transport and wood for fish farm is inkinded, as well as four cages are prepared for floating in the Nile. Beautiful brick samples are taken by village employee for testing. Experimental plot in the desert is irrigated and planted. Bayad market opens. Guest flat is inkinded in Cairo. GCF Egypt is launched with great demonstration village visit in Bayad.

Internal: Global Wedge team visits and spins House into practical grasp of maneuvering with overfilled table at every meal, including strong village presence with three new interns.

Contradiction: Creating the structural forms to allow Project acceleration to continue. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Lonrho calls to offer funding for Project in Tanzania. Coop truck returns to Kawangware from repair shop after substitute truck's engine explodes. Rev. May and Steth from Washington, D.C., visit Kawangware explaining, "This visit made our week." Machahas District Coop officer visits Kawangware to learn about Kawangware Cooperative Society and how Kamwelini might use a similar model. Mr. Chandaria from an international funding group arrives unexpectedly to check on progress of proposal.

Internal: House participates in a great collegium which looks at the progress of the 17 programs and names the degree of completion.

Contradiction: Finding engagement for all that allows weight of the world experience and releases new possibility. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP

External: A week of beginning victories includes sending community farmers and two ICA staff for dry land farming

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP)
training. The people meeting in stakes decide to buy 4000 trees to prevent erosion. The nursery begins with an enrollment of 40. More community-owned land is discovered. The total community is surveyed for health conditions. A new industry is set up to go next week.

Internal: The House is supported and spiritized by daily gifts of maize from numerous people. Ecclesiola is opened with charcoal-grilled popped corn-on-the-cob. Bob Prunuske, Guardian from Milwaukee, leads the preschool.

Contradiction: Maintaining a constant drive with each separate location for cooking, housekeeping, sleeping and the corporate mission. (Wk. 10)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: House inkind 40 reams of paper, plastic pitchers, glasses, crockery, watermelon and a continuous supply of hot Indian dinners. Tata assigns its representative to Chikhale. Patrons Odyssey visits Bombay on the way to Maliwada.

Internal: Final ecclesiola for Quarter is celebrated with the study of Gandhi's paper on "Village Reconstruction." House rallies in a collegium on "Principles of Winning."

Contradiction: Accelerating the last 100 meters of the inkind mile race during Continental Council and post-council preparation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh.

Colleagues arrive from Chikali and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI

External: Khadi village industires meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP

External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Internal: Tom and Connie Greyslock arrive from Lorne to pick up new assignment. San Antonio business community continues to make maneuver planning and debriefing Week IIs great events at mealtimes.

Contradiction: Going back to old territory when the new is beckoning. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Colleagues meet around the table to design format for the Oklahoma Report. Towns are sending snapshots and reports on the followup to Town Meeting: Oklahoma 100.

Internal: Two House members return from a month of stomping in Texas during the Lone Star Stampede.

Contradiction: Discerning the timing for detonating the charges that have been set in place through TM. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: One hundred sixty county Town Meetings have been held in Texas, and 43 are scheduled out of 254 Texas counties. Of the first 185 Town Meetings average attendance has been 71, average money raised has been \$177 per TM. House inkind six car weeks from General Motors.

Internal: Saturday night celebration is held in home-created Western saloon with spaghetti dinner, card dealing and limerick writing. The winning limerick was: There once was a man from Development/ Who thought personal problems were irrelevant/ He went out in a car/ Didn't get very far/ And came back on an inkind elephant.

Contradiction: Making every TM a sign to Texas and to the world. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: A proposal is submitted to EDA at their request, accompanied by four Pace citizens beginning a course in small business management. Final decision is made on annexation area in comprehensive plan.

Internal: The celebration of the completed life of Barbara Joan Smith takes place on Saturday, January 28, with whole House's integral participation in both practice and drama.

Contradiction: Focusing action in visible miracles while simultaneously doing necessary long-range tactics. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: With troops spread out across the south, Day II troops set up one Town Meeting.

Internal: House obtains a three-hour night job that almost reaches the self-support goal.

Contradiction: Maintaining the stance of the spirit man in the midst of the shortage of troops. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Town Meeting set-up goes. Three visits produce three dates in diverse Savage, Mississippi, Douglas, Tennessee; and Frog Jump, Tennessee, with Mississippi state campaign in full swing.

Internal: Proposed area meeting to be held in Memphis puts new edge to moving it as inkind gets a work-over.

Contradiction: Mopping up West Tennessee with finesse. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: The Atlanta House works with the area patrol team to create the model and initiate visits that will move the Atlanta Region toward becoming a major source for developing funds. House receives its first significant contribution ever in the form of a \$500 check from the Trust Company Banks of Georgia.

Internal: Local colleague couple invite selves to ecclesiola and arrive with steak and chicken for all as "The New Castle" study provides basis for spin-offs on Profound Humanness.

Contradiction: Breaking open self-support so that another circuit team can get on the road. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Two circuit teams set up five TM and hold 12. Visible, physical vulnerability (being in towns eight hours from the House) is discovered as a gift as local community contacts host circuiters with meals and lodging.

Internal: Spaghetti dinner celebration at Guardians' home provides nurture for troops and Guardians.

Contradiction: Resisting the temptation to schedule the maneuver to end so quickly that learnings and documentation are honored. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The Miami House turns five counties yellow, Brevard, St. Lucie, Palm Beach, Hardee, Collier and finds troops working in Glade, Hendry, Sarasota, Martin, Indian River and Highlands Counties, moving toward TM dates in Weeks 11 and 12.

Internal: A fine celebrational happening holds the life tension of the joy of winning and the frustration of the incomplete as steak is consumed while Franey and Zoey are revisited.

Contradiction: Discovering how to use the accumulative advantage of the last two quarters to finish the state. (Wk. 10)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Nexus continues to send special forces to seven states to do TMs. The Patron Odyssey returns to the United States after spending three weeks in HDPs around the globe. Economic acceleration trek leaves for Delta Pace. Work begins on the Guardians Consult.

Internal: The Nexus welcomes back Robert Shropshire, Isobel and Jim Bishop and Robert Fishel from the HDTS training events held in Maliwada and Kwangyung II and hears image exploding reports at Nexus feet-on-the-table evenings.

International Academy participants begin to arrive.

Contradiction: Preparing the way for the U.S. 12. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Forty residents attend auxiliary meeting. Lilly Fox leads GWF in Washington, D.C. Joseph Mwenya is new Sandwich Shop financial advisor. Father Geno Baroni of U.S. Housing and Urban Development, Washington, visits Fifth City and is presented an Iron Man.

Internal: Monmouth United Methodist Church, 34 strong, visits Fifth City and Judy Boyd from Phoenix stays a week working on Health Center space and files.

Contradiction: Bridging the imaginal gap relative to accelerating and completing the Project. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Oxford sends in its postcard and 100 people appear at Town Meeting, thereby impressing two metro colleague observers as orchestrators. Burden mayor invites other town councils and four attend first real demonstration TM in Kansas, including council that had given cold reception last year.

Internal: Dick Gregory contexts global strategies saying "Keep your eyes on Africa," and calls for "spirituality" not "religiosity," reminding all that local men can "turn this thing around."

Contradiction: Teaching cows to write proposals. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Cooperative Development effort opens doors to Roman Catholic Orders, new adopt-a-village churches, Chamber of Commerce access to key corporate and religious leadership and Guardian and patron involvement, while contacts begin in 20 counties for two TM assemblies.

Internal: House and Development team celebrate victory at local pub where House is regaled with stories of sea cucumbers, shark fishing, and other adventures of HDP formulation.

Contradiction: Building victory stories that embody reality and disclose future possibility. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: House meshes 49 Development calls across Missouri with TMs being held, capitalizing on nearby TMs held and scheduled.

Internal: House celebrates the Missouri Waltz campaign around a fireplace presumed for six years to be nonfunctioning, releasing the troops to view the globe through Walt and Pam Blood's report on Majuro and Kate St. Clair's report on Global Women's Forum.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in the face of a shift in troops strength while turning toward Kansas. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: House hosts Dabhad dinner to celebrate Minnesota's adopted village with 26 guests, with before and after slides of Maliwada.

Internal: Campaign unity of Global Servant Force impacts as circuiters join with Rapid City colleagues in South Dakota after six weeks of corporately setting up state campaign.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS)

Contradiction: Adjusting calendar so global priorities do not fall away. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: GWF planning meeting sets date for April 26, reveals strong support from the University of Missouri and considers various imaginably discontinuous locations for course, including Mississippi river boats and the arch. Development mailing to 130 corporations is sent.

Contradiction: Maintaining the advantage of acceleration of troop engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Three TMs are held. Len Hockley opens authorization and Development doors by visiting old family friends. Three teams grid an area of Detroit in preparation for Town Meetings.

Internal: Moving on self-support through search for job, grant, and a new facility happens in one week.

Contradiction: Catalyzing troop engagement in all areas, regionally and continentally. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Comprehensive plan is completed for Kentucky Appalachian Advance with initial Town Meetings set up and mailing materials on their way.

Contradiction: Managing March to advance on April. (Wk. 10)

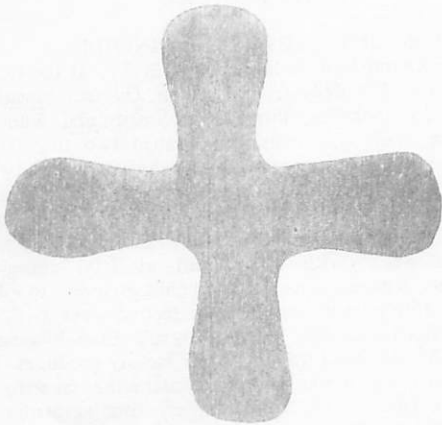

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Concentrated Development push along with major inkind maneuver promise exciting breakthroughs.

Internal: Report on India framing swirls spirits as well as missional images.

Contradiction: Prioritizing tasks so that Continental Council preparation is done effectively without overriding the 1000 other tasks. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Building the tactical implementation system which allows all troops to do required maneuver follow-up. (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Treks travel to the north and the south, with the Vienna/Munich circuit recruiting two for Wales Consult and possible intern family. The trek sets up a work camp for the Wales Project and does preliminary work on two LENS courses and village TMs. The trek to Ruhr sets up one more meeting in that area and makes arrangement for the rally on April 11. Town Meeting in one small section of a highrise model city is a great event with 70 adults present as well as 70 children.

Internal: Continental Development PSU participation in Brussels begins a week concentrating on caring for colleagues across Germany with mailings for the Wales Consult and the Guardians Consult.

Contradiction: Maximizing effectiveness of upcoming training events with students of college for social pedagogy. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The pen used by five Kreuzberg Ost residents to sign the contract for the new community center is auctioned off for 186 marks to go to the center's renovation. Children's after school program goes to the theater. Elders give 160 marks plus inkind curtains, and supplies for the new center. Funding for the new center looks promising as the city expresses interest in German tutoring classes for children of guest workers.

Internal: Paul Evans visits House on way from Kamweleni.

and Kapini Consults to Tairgwaith Consult and does slide show for guild. Oylers visit Kreuzberg Ost, possibly for the last time before moving to new assignment in Ijede. House spends Good Friday in quarter planning session.

Contradiction: Finding the overall images that give focus to a quarter filled with doing six major maneuvers, continuing and expanding ongoing programs and maintaining emphasis on GCF and Development. (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: Kapini HDP is launched with 700 at the Consult Opening and 125 daily from 7:00 on. Outside consultants swell to 35, including three from Shantumbu who have joined the staff. One consultant loaned two tractors and ploughs to the demonstration farm, which now has 19 seed beds of assorted vegetables planted over one acre. Expert Johannes Ochilles Mutoka arrived from Kawangware to gun Farming Guild. All six guilds are moving into full-day action the first week, with 50 present at 7:00 collegiums. Community Kitchen serves 220 lunches each day to village, including 150 preschoolers now in second week with nine locally trained teachers. Steven Muyaule from Shantumbu launches the preschool training. Brick factory produces 174 soil-cement bricks in one day. The construction crew digs the foundation for the 13 room auxiliary training center. The Health Guild does full survey of the village as it works toward a health fair in three weeks. Ten stake women are accepted for residential midwifery course in Kabwe. The first tent store opens with bread and basics.

Internal: The Consult holds feast of endings at the Intercontinental Hotel with Joseph Kameme as the m.c.

Contradiction: Getting the community structures operating to channel the energy released by the Consult. (Wk. 13)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Successful firing of 10,000 brick kiln launches regular production and marketing, and is marked with celebration at the factory, complete with dancing. The guilds spend four hours planning for Quarter IV. The desert plot is green with a variety of plants. A successful fish catch is ready for stocking cages in the river. The elders' feeding program is begun.

Internal: Dr. and Mrs. Alex Neill visit with sons Alex and Ken. Kenya colleagues, Benedette and Humphry, come for a month in Bayad on the way home from the HDTS in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Getting comprehensive form around new push from the community elicited by the presence of trucks, successful brick burn and the marmalade industry. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Management team goes to Sydney to launch audit trek. The Wedge team enables area to deal with Priority Number 6 as they pass through to Manila. GWF trek moves to Area Singapore with arrival of Kate St. Clair. CYF trek plans are being formulated.

Internal: House goes to see a Mandarin Shaolin movie called "36 Shaolin Chambers." Titus and Augusta Jayasekra on their way back from Korea to Australia HDTS, visit.

Contradiction: Getting beyond the planning stage to the implementation. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP

External: Community leadership meeting draws 85% of adult population who all squeeze into the little Catholic church, the largest room in the community. More than 50% of the adult population attends stake meetings, representing 75% of the homes. Community time design is consensed on. District cooperative officer agrees to allow a special village project coop, pattered after the Kawangware Cooperative. District forester brings 2,000 trees and demonstrates how to plant them. Community water project is begun, having confirmed the proposed intake tank site as having the proper rock formation. Road signs for the sleeve industry and the nursery school provide concretions for the public tours which occur with each passing of the newly instituted regular taxi service. The first adult education night blasts off with the first Village Meeting training, industrial training, studying blueprint reading and literacy classes in Kikamba, Kiswahili and English languages.

Internal: Nicholous Kisumbe and Benedetta Mbithe move into the dormitories.

Contradiction: Doing comprehensive planning when the community's hunger for increasing weekly engagement impinges on staff's time. (Wk. 13)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Pilo Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige) married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: House inkind 40 reams of paper, plastic pitchers, glasses, crockery, watermelon and a continuous supply of hot Indian dinners. Tata assigns its representative to Chikhale. Patrons Odyssey visits Bombay on the way to Maliwada.

Internal: Final ecclesiola for Quarter is celebrated with the study of Gandhi's paper on "Village Reconstruction." House rallies in a collegium on "Principles of Winning."

Contradiction: Accelerating the last 100 meters of the inkind mile race during Continental Council and post-council preparation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of

Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhir HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industires meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a diary scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON – ANJANGAON HDP
External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wodegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP
External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluke donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI
External: A broad sweep of the western district for site selection clarifies the issue of proximity and of villages in need. The drive for funding HDTs participants continues.

Internal: House sends out Vivian Paul and Anthony Paul with four other to HDTs. After fasting, House and metro colleagues celebrate Holly, traditional Hindu harvest festival, by throwing 500 liters of colored water on each other and feasting in the home of an orthodox Hindu colleague.

Contradiction: Wrestling with the issue of finding a village sufficiently accessible that also has catalytic potential for development. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP
External: A trek to Vijaywada, the cyclone area, secures a contract for nutri-food produced in Nadlapur. The state of Banhof, Hyderabad, gives blanket permission for village well loans. The Chairman of Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company commits half of his talk at annual meeting to NHDP. The government gives 11,600 rupees to construct a preschool and community kitchen complex with a women's activity center.

Internal: Staff welcomes a retired nurse who, after one day in the Project, decides to intern. The final stages of the new House for the auxiliary is accelerated by a shramdan constructing a compound wall and plastering the walls.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS
External: House treks to Apia for initial village site selection. TM trek to Penang initiates GCF campaign in Malaysia.

Internal: House quarterly celebration is held at Neptune Theater for dinner, dancing, and floor show. Wedge team arrives from Apia, Hong Kong and Washington, D.C.

Internal: Newest addition to House, Michael Musashi Jenkins, arrives with his mother for the first addition of the year.

Contradiction: Contacting Protestants in face of evolving structures. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: As colleague, Tomoko Matsutani, is sent out to Academy, Kii Village Town Meeting, with new leadership and GWF planning highlight the importance of getting to the underlying contradiction. Ten colleagues at the Quarter IV Planning Council decide to follow up GWFs with Town Meetings when they create an ambitious six-month calendar that emphasizes more training.

Internal: Maundy Thursday celebration of the Last Supper with neighborhood colleagues highlights the universality of the Word. Neighbors in Nishinari-ku bring in O-sushi (raw fish with rice) and fruits to celebrate the presence of Hong Hang Wa and Angela Wong from Nam Wai.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of the ripeness of TM breakthrough when the volume of urgent tasks threatens to consume time. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: The arrival of Joseph Iida and Akira Miyazaki to each Imaginal Education course catalyzes visit by Mr. Sato, chairman of Oyubari Development Committee, and its newly elected steering committee with the ICA staff to map out future cooperation in planning and implementing programs. The head of Sorachi-Shiko district agrees to set up Chiiki Kondonkai circuits throughout the rest of Hokkaido.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The regional set-up team of Murrin Bridge HDP for the third week in a row is carrying the fruits of the week's inkling to set up auxiliary in Project and prepare for Consult. National authorization visits with Apex and Jaycees, lay ground work for task force implementation for MHDP Consult, HDTs and Queensland new site.

Internal: Garnet Banks give SEAPAC report. House sends out John Telford to Tasmania CMA maneuver. Area House is transformed into war camp for March - April maneuver with five new area squads in operation.

Contradiction: Discovering new sources to release \$100,000 for present dreamtime - Wunan maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

Contradiction: Getting the task sharp to indicate where people's engagement will lie. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Key people visit for Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as areal demands shift. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: GWF allows women to be "Queens for a day." The first of 12 new houses is started. Community holds meeting to limit credit at Kitco with great results and a visit by the community health director ends with a new friend for Oombulgurri. One staff and three community people go to Department of Aboriginal Affairs' bookkeepers course. Three community people and Ken Otto go to Murrin Bridge Consult. Friendly visit from DAA and a new bookkeeper bring hopes of easing the financial tension.

Internal: Auxiliary maintain two cows in Wyndham on a rotational milking schedule. Two ICA babies are given bush names, Andrew Baker is Gullaroo (Rainbow) and Adam Brown is Daddaway Lungamari (an old man's name who used to live at a waterhole called Daddaway).

Contradiction: Directing community momentum toward the HDTs. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: A trek to Torke Peninsula launches the state campaign as a Monalta Community Meeting is held in the suburbs on the same day as the Adelaide GWF. Youth raise \$27 toward Oombulgurri Youth Trek.

Internal: David White breezes through again; GWF team leaves.

Contradiction: Keeping the state campaign moving while the Murrin Bridge Consult looms. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: House secures factory for inkind prefab of HDTs tables. Week II trek to Murrin Bridge includes three Oombulgurri men and Maxine. Speakers to Myrtleford Apex experience six-car relay trip after brakes fail on House car.

Internal: Two guests and all Oombulgurri youth become fully engaged in charting and study of ecclesiola paper on "the new missionary." Inkind file cabinet claims the promise of order in the chaos of House files.

Contradiction: Prioritizing multiple demands in order to win with all of them. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House has immigration breakthrough. Two Murrin Bridge consultants sign up. Regional DAA authorizes Murrin Bridge HDP. Operations travels through lower SEAPAC. Members attend GWF training and authorization trip to Apia.

Contradiction: Assigning necessary troops to HDP funding and HDTs and GCF state campaigns. (Wk. 10)

Internal: Weekend work team from Sydney erects front fence, makes curtains and brings Olive back and Peter Richardson to Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Integrating pre-Consult momentum while holding community open for new configurations after the Consult. (Wk. 13)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

External: "Five Finger Foods" were served at the Caretakers Guild meeting, using some of the vegetables that grow wild here but have not been used in the diet since the Japanese time.

Internal: First Saturday rain in seven weeks postpones the domet dramas and enables House to intensify battleplanning for Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Recruiting the "Mighty Forth" stake and guild leaders, for the community planning day Week 13. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: GCF translation workshop and village set-up visits enables metro cadre decision to di first GCF in Samoan language.

Internal: Ecclesiola Gandhi study excites participants with possibility of giving a year of service in HDP.

Contradiction: Deciding that the necessary deeds for HDP and GCF can be done by three adults and one infant in the House. (Wk. 13)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Idaho turns beautiful yellow as the final Town

Meetings are finished, at the same time the global team does the selection of the site for the California Human Development Project.

Internal: Area Council preparation, inkind proposals, Easter discontinuity, and guests (including thee Japanese women with tales of Oyubari, Academy anticipation, plus an Order youth on college break and Roberta Beebe's mother) provide a varied and full week.

Contradiction: Deciding that the action is here and that House is not an isolated outpost with all the action happening somewhere else. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Thirty-five attend Evening with the Institute at Fresno, prepared for and hosted by Fresno cadre.

Internal: Staff decides to hold weekly cadre meetings in Fresno in preparation for California HDP.

Contradiction: Creating a timeline that holds the comprehensive task toward Project initiation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Sacramento cadre participates in updating Global Index and mailing regional newsletter for California Project participation.

Internal: House decides to hold methods consultations for new colleagues resulting from eight Sacramento Town Meetings and their interested agencies.

Contradiction: Coordinating details for the California HDP preparation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Contradiction: Recruiting for the GWF and HDP consultants. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Wyoming Town Meeting is held in town of 850 population that has been in existence only 18 months and is made up totally of trailers.

Internal: Ecclesiola is highlighted by studies from Gandhi, impacted by the fact that much of context is taken from his work on Village Construction. The crucifixion and resurrection are celebrated with Stations of the Cross on Good Friday and a special Easter House Church.

Contradiction: Gaining traction for momentum in the mud caused by a flood fo new demands. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Reports come in from Ennis family in Idaho that 16 more TMs are completed there.

Internal: Neighborhood comes for Easter House Church.

Contradiction: Doing what needs to be done while looking forward to new assignments and events in the coming quarter. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY-INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: New assault on North Dakota TM is launched with letter from Governor Link in the packets mailed to the 22 remaining counties. Day Care staff, in regular weekly training session, is grounded in Imaginal Education and sends two teachers to visit Fifth City Preschool.

Internal: Global trip report catalyzes second week of depth brooding and "new life" in form of new paint in the auxiliary kitchen and collegium space.

Contradiction: Continuing to discovering the images that require the community to do the Project. (Wk. 13)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Area meets in Vogar, after inking for a whole week, for Council looking over past quarter and looking toward next two years.

Contradiction: Trying to relax in order to speed up. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

GCF for Mount Waddington Regional District is initiated by telephone and mail. Forum interest is sparked in Sparwood. Internal: Bruce Thomson is sent out to link with area troops for Golden orchestration. Spins from the global trip report recreate fresh and exciting images of the globe and missional engagement of colleagues.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

Contradiction: Allowing colleagues to experience the formation of the new Movement and see others engaged in the common task over distance. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG-VOGAR HDP

External: Acceleration occurs on all fronts with seven CFCs, Vogar Voice resuming circulation and Vogar Projects being assessed and approved by LEAP Project representative.

Internal: Discontinuous day in Winnipeg ending with a Mexican celebration provides alternate beat to weekly practices and Area Council planning.

Contradiction: Exploding and accelerating that which is begun. (Wk. 11)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: House continues to support TM by orchestrating those in nearby counties. Permeators do four in one week. Development team returns.

Internal: House celebrates Maundy Thursday with neighborhood local church. Geoff Nixon gives collegium on Latin American site selection.

Contradiction: Defining the role of the House in golden Texas. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: House prepares for next edition of Texas State Newsletter. Academy recruitment begins.

Internal: Colleague prepares New Mexico style enchiladas for ecclesiola feast.

Contradiction: Breaking physical and spiritual inertia with impending county completion and House recovering from flu. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Lone Star Stampede enters third week of circuits in the six-week maneuver with 14 dates set on southern front.

Internal: Tom and Connie Greyslock arrive from Lome to pick up new assignment. San Antonio business community continues to make maneuver planning and debriefing Week IIs great events at mealtimes.

Contradiction: Going back to old territory when the new is beckoning. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Colleagues meet around the table to design format for the Oklahoma Report. Towns are sending snapshots and reports on the followup to Town Meeting: Oklahoma 100.

Internal: Two House members return from a month of stomping in Texas during the Lone Star Stampede.

Contradiction: Discerning the timing for detonating the charges that have been set in place through TM. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Twelve more counties are done with 39 left to do as attendance continues to rise. After participating in the Rosebud TM, the executive director of the Heart of Texas Council of Governments asks ICA to come train his staff in team methods. Adamson High School requests a TM.

Internal: Colleagues enable full participation in Area Council by caring for nine Emerging Generation. House support roles for Quarter IV will be key in intensifying the effort to finish 453 TMs in Area Houston and launch three new HDPs.

Contradiction: Closing the Lone Star Stampede with 30 widely scattered counties left to do. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Economic acceleration week victories include 12 business ventures researched, nine ventures phased to begin operation over the next three months with all tactics lined out, a trip to Cuba (Missouri) to inspect machinery necessary for a prospective industry producing specialty concrete block products, visits from potential business partners in banking, laundry/dry cleaning, pharmacy and the "Patio Paver" industry. A focus on the restaurant/bakery results in a building secured and lease signed (rent free for two years), significant inking of lighting, wiring, paint, ceiling and floor materials and even a three-compartment sink. Saturday workday miracles include first coat of paint, major renovation and innovative landscaping, transforming a nondescript building into a place any community would be proud to display.

Internal: Participating in the economic trek were three global staff, two colleagues from Area New York, three from Area Chicago and three from Area Houston.

Contradiction: Continuing momentum created by trek. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Mississippi is complete, all but three counties, and Louisiana all but two counties.

Internal: March to the Beach by March, the Mississippi maneuver slogan, is celebrated on the gulf coast beach in Pascagoula with inkind chicken, beer, marshmallows and chocolate.

Contradiction: Doing self-support within a tight timeline to finish the counties. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Dyersburg, Tennessee, black church TM, notches Dyer county and excites the churchmen to take immediate action to organize District F and give leads into undone counties. Mississippi troops report state very near completion with Philadelphia, Mississippi TM the highlight of the week with old civil rights warhorses in attendance and Pace's Robert Towers' casual talk of being a policeman in Pace, the worm farms and community meetings turns their hostility into creative ideas about a plan to change Philadelphia.

Internal: Lunch hour phoning nets inked Area Council and great event in the hosting of 80 colleagues from the Southern fronts. Plans in council seem to emerge quicker as maneuvers are written with ease. Blues Alley in Memphis is a winner with Piano Sam singing and welcoming the TM folks for celebration.

Contradiction: Enacting a broad plan to raise excess self-support while completing West Tennessee and assisting with forthcoming Tennessee maneuver. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Town Meeting in Donalsonville, Seminole county, with over 60 from the establishment in attendance and \$500 chick continues the break-open of Southwest Georgia as the House readies for the massive Georgia push in Quarter IV.

Internal: House spends three days battleplanning for massive Quarter IV push and creates the plan for winning with key state-wide networks, such as Georgia Municipal Association, Georgia Power, Georgia Bankers Association and the County Extension Agents.

Contradiction: Breaking open the entres that will allow the massive inkind and quick-set victories to hold 130 Town Meetings in Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

Internal: A fine celebrational happening holds the life tension of the joy of winning and the frustration of the incomplete as steak is consumed while Franny and Zoey are revisited.

Contradiction: Discovering how to use the accumulative advantage of the last two quarters to finish the state. (Wk. 10)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Nexus sends staff to the Murrin Bridge HDP Consult in Australia and the Tairgwaith HDP Consult in Wales as well as to six state campaigns for TM in the United States. Representatives from the Nexus go site selecting in Idaho, North Carolina and in Texas. Preparations continue for the Guardians Consult, including a weekend Guardian task force that redecorates the second floor and builds tables for the cafe, leaving the Nexus impacted by their presence.

Internal: Academy begins with over 70 around the table. Nexus does quarter maneuvers and reconfigures in support structures designed to carry all through the summer.

Contradiction: Turning emphasis to the USA 12 and summer plans. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Forty residents attend auxiliary meeting. Lilly Fox leads GWF in Washington, D.C. Joseph Mwenya is new Sandwich Shop financial advisor. Father Geno Baroni of U.S. Housing and Urban Development, Washington, visits Fifth City and is presented an Iron Man.

Internal: Monmouth United Methodist Church, 34 strong, visits Fifth City and Judy Boyd from Phoenix stays a week working on Health Center space and files.

Contradiction: Bridging the imaginal gap relative to accelerating and completing the Project. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: TM: Kansas stretches from border to border as Denver orchestrates two in the northwest corner, Kansas City schedules four northeast counties and a solid stake is driven in west central Kansas with the Dighton TM of 50 conservative wheat farmers.

Internal: Marcia Friebel orchestrates four TMs in ten-day visit and sets up eastern Kansas. Dave Jackson confirms six and initiates one in half-day stopover. Kansas TM Workbook goes into third printing as city circuiters discover feedlots, fertilizer and farmland.

Contradiction: Utilizing two troops to orchestrate seven TMs and complete Kansas set-up before Friday. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Circuiters speed home from area council to do four TMs in seven counties, raising an average of \$70 from each community with one town having 50% of its population in attendance. IBM donates typewriter just in time for TM: Nebraska newsletter.

Internal: Charles Catlett moves in to sojourn for HDP countdown and county completion.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA)

Contradiction: Enabling people to see themselves able to break loose for one month to two years by grounding Nebraska story in the global. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Staffed by metro colleagues and youth cluster, Northwest Missouri Assembly experiences a great formulation event.

Internal: Ecclesiola reflects excitement of metro colleagues' experience in site selection.

Contradiction: Allowing the metro to image the comprehensive without slacking on the particular. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: House hosts Dabhad dinner to celebrate Minnesota's adopted village with 26 guests, with before and after slides of Maliwada.

Internal: Campaign unity of Global Servant Force impacts as circuiters join with Rapid City colleagues in South Dakota after six weeks of corporately setting up state campaign.

Contradiction: Adjusting calendar so global priorities do not fall away. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: The Ilini Express chugs along with four more TMs and \$250 on this end of the track.

Internal: Special troops from Chicago and Vermont enable program and reflection. House celebrates Easter at local church.

Contradiction: Setting up resistant Wabash Basin sector before planned Assembly. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Over 140 people from 45 communities drove as long as four hours to attend the Iowa Town Meeting Assembly, which was held in the Iowa Farm Bureau headquarters and enabled by 30 colleagues from around the state. U.S. Senator John Culver closed the day, which also completed a 50-page state report and payed for itself.

Internal: Celebration following the Town Meeting Assembly is major breakthrough in collegiality with several new colleagues deciding to go to the Guardians Consult and help with the HDP this Spring. House welcomes newest member, Jessica Aiko Krauss, born March 2, 1978, weighing 6 lb. 12 oz.

Contradiction: Securing the ground that has been won with immediate and careful follow-up. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Six new counties are colored in as Ogema wants to be a GSD site and Meadowbrook participants are ready to begin saturation in their county.

Internal: Sumptuous Easter feast is held in newly-decorated collegium room, with Quarter IV battleplan already on wall.

Contradiction: Getting tuned into a new, as-yet unnamed groove. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Slide show of HDP Consults around the globe at the home of Bob and Virginia Giese impacts 30 bi-metro colleagues and begins the spin of, "And what are we going to do in Wisconsin?"

Internal: Phase One discusses plans for the summer and four guests impact the House: Wilbur Leatherman on his way back from TM in Florida, Jim Ed Bell back from Ijede, Jane St. John visiting parents for Easter, and Trudi Mueller visiting

her older sister on Trudi's way to South America.

Contradiction: Intensifying the mission as greater concrete clarity is brought to all situations while colleagues have already decided that the Easter vacation is for vacating the bimetro. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The week is highlighted with a great TM in Rosedale, Indiana, with 61 citizens present. Guardian recruitment discovers 10 colleagues who are planning to attend and Jeanne Wilson accepts overseas assignment for a month-long GWF trek. Over 150 letters go out on Good Friday to 13 counties of southwest Indiana plus the Kokomo slice.

Internal: Easter House Church and discontinuity provide new momentum and energy for the three campaigns.
