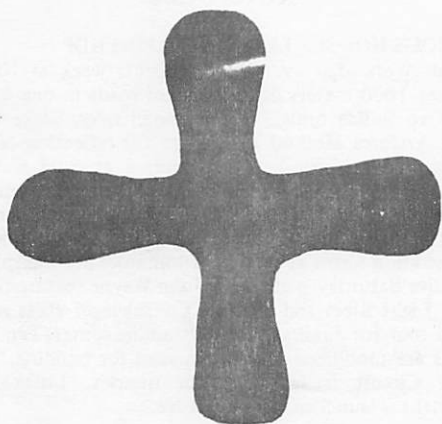

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: First Annual Report of the ICA charitable trust published total income for the year is \$56,500.

Internal: House goes to Mahler's Resurrection Symphony performed at Royal Albert Hall and sits directly above the percussion section-magnificent. Guests include JoAnn Slicker on her way to India and Sr. Benedict from Paris, whose order has cared for the Paris House, on her way to the International Conference of Christian Women (Professional) at Corrymeela in Ireland.

Contradiction: Naming the specific locus of death ground in the midst of 25 different battlegrounds. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development week once again affirms there is money in Scotland with visits to CBI, Carnegie UK Trust and Tennant-Caledonian Brewers.

Internal: House experiences wayside inn dynamic as David Cunningham, Carole Johnson and Huang Hsing Peng spend time in house. House takes care of itself through ur collegium, ecclesiola and Cunningham/Dempster document preparation.

Contradiction: Keeping things moving with a sense of urgency. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL-TAIRGWAITH HDP

External: Visits by Development Centrum for a 'tour' of the project along with others such as the Probation Officer for the County continue to be most supportive and willing to plug in where needed. County delivers the wood and other supplies needed for the repair of the bus shelter.

Internal: Evening at the home of the District Education Officer is socially and missionally helpful—a delicious buffet served with a view of the valley.

Contradiction: Focusing on the three-month task while an office and housing facility are not immediately available. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Six Town Meetings are on the road to completion in phase I of Operation Strongbow. CYF is held on May Day in Newcastle with 22 youth present.

Internal: London colleague journeys to treat House to special champagne and bacon breakfast.

Contradiction: Completing England gold to enable Europe gold, while pursued by the context to have to do England "to the bottom." (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum of 45 people in Vaugines colored the Cote d'Azur region yellow.

Internal: New room created out of old hallway is finished and moved into.

Contradiction: Discovering the transition that maximizes time to spend on "in House" tasks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: A TM is held in a small village in southern Italy in 38 hours and 45 people attend.

Internal: Guardians, Richard and Louise LeBlanc and Lorraine McGovern working this year in the project return from Guardians continental meeting in Brussels to give a great report.

Contradiction: Continuing full speed ahead when \$1,000 for Centro Sociale, Phase II, has not arrived. (Wk. 6)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Ijede pier (150 ft. by 5 ft.) is finished. First nets

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE : LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

for the Ijede Fish Pens are in the lagoon and stocking has begun. Industry visits reveal excellent possibility for bed sheet/pillowcase industry. First mailing for August ITI is begun.

Internal: Mailing blitz and celebration give discontinuity.

Contradiction: Winning the war while achieving victories on all fronts. (Wk. 5)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Engagement across two continents grounds and broadens task.

Internal: Organizing ecclesiola to include workshop from CYF as sodality informs House/Nexus and trains guests.

Contradiction: Developing screens adequate to minister to new arenas of engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELSs,

External: West Flanders goes gold. Ministry of Culture Youth Inspector and wife are trained to do CYF.

Internal: Organizing ecclesiola to include workshop from CYF as sodality to inform House and train guests.

Contradiction: Putting practical wheels on Development maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Twenty-six colleagues from across the Netherlands gather to hear each other's stories about Wales, Kapini, Kelapa Dua and Maharashtra, and discover each other as the movement in Holland. At least one "yes" and one probable are secured for U.S. Consults.

Internal: Dutch nurse, Paula Hondeman, returns from India excited and full of stories, just in time to greet Jorrit van Wijk, who begins sojourn in preparation for work in Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Creating the structure that ensures ongoing engagement activities for the many colleagues emerging. (Wk. 6)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The use of local guides in villages and the practical engaging of contacts and grads enable the set-up of two Community Youth Forums (including \$250 funding), one GWF and one TM. Four potential volunteers, ranging from age 20 to 58, are enlisted for the summer months in Ijede. The Sri Lankan ambassador to Sweden, after visiting the House, offers to give ICA staff the red carpet treatment should they visit Sri Lanka to select a site.

Internal: The insight that the task is still and forever primarily movement-building causes a mid-stream decision to do a newsletter to assist in implementing several maneuvers, primarily the participation in North American Consults and the GRA.

Contradiction: Increasing the number of contacts in small villages. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Completion of Fassade of "Treffpunkt" demonstrates seriousness and adds a touch of sparkle to the street while inkind paint and linoleum worth 1000s of DMs enables interior of treffpunkt to be near completion. First community event is a play by children at local school

attended by 100 people.

Internal: Send out of Mary Jane on Indian dance group tour shifts responsibilities and enables new roles.

Contradiction: Expanding the base of community participation and arenas in which to develop leadership. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: Work day by stakes highlights week as 100 iron men clear 1000 meters of new Kapini roads in one day and Stake Two builds bridge to span small river. Stake leaders train in Artform Method to prepare for reflection on work day. Document is finished and studied at guild and stake meetings. Long visit to a member of the Central Committee with document and picture flip-book deepens government support of the Project. Another two acres are donated to Demonstration Farm as 1/2 acre of tomatoes are transplanted. Celebrative Saturday night with John Wayne feature film is a big hit. Light Steel and Roofing Co. manager visits site and donated roof for auxiliary House/training center. Ten Kapini ox carts are mobilized to bring in sand for building. Village Meeting Circuit is laid out for quarter. Lusaka GWF recruitment is launched for Week Five.

Internal: House welcomes Carin Schuchart's assignment to KHDP. Tent loan is extended two weeks, postponing the raising of a temporary staff shelter.

Contradiction: Broadening KHDP participation beyond the core 60 to include more of Phases III and IV. (Wk. 6)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Monday night stake leaders' training enables new depth and participation in stake planning and follow through.

Internal: House trip to Suez Canal on national holiday, "Smell the Fresh Breezes" day, reveals both the ravages of war and the decision to rebuild.

Contradiction: Pulling through concrete signs of victory. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: GWFs are held in Kamweleni and Nairobi. The Coop moves on bulk purchasing through Kawangware Business Association, a newly created division. A week-long training session for 13 Kawangware Youth Corps and seven preschool teachers from Kamweleni builds curriculum and ends with a fantastic Ur celebration. The 29th district in Kenya turns yellow.

Internal: GWF team, Nancy Prather and Jeanne Wilson, join with three local staff to do three GWFs. Charles Hahn and Barbara Williams bring news from Europe and helpful data on Management and Operations.

Contradiction: Doing the homework that allows catalysis and releases significant engagement. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP

External: Murram block production begins. Sleeve industry production is up to 40,000 per week. Villagers help get inkind transport for lumber for the school, free from the national forest. First Harambee fund-raising in Kamweleni led by six government officials does local Development for primary school. Community meeting divides into pre-guild

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELINI-KAMWELINI HDP) structures.

Internal: Management trek visits Project and moves area Houses to new financial structure. House sends out Tolman and Zaid for site selection.

Contradiction: Enabling decisions to be carried out. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: President of India hears Nava Gram Prayas (New Village Movement) story in Delhi as Maliwada villagers meet Mr. George Fernandes, friend and cabinet minister for Industries, in Aurangabad and Mrs. Piloos Modi, wife of member of Parliament who is architect of Janata Party, comes to Maliwada. Greaves Group directors and wives also visit Maliwada to see the HDP and catch vision of possibility for the villages of Kendur and Tembhurwahi which they are funding.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. and Mrs. Brian Fisher (Marguerite Le Paige, married January 17, and sends Brenda and Shrivastwa to Takli for monitoring. Acceleration teams are on the go as health trek returns from Kolambi and agriculture and industry treks depart.

Contradiction: Internalizing the TAB Manual (Tactical Action Book) in consensus-making dynamic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Acceleration team works a week in Chikhale. Development circuit continues developing a state-wide guardian network. State Bank of India opens doors for complete concrete cooperation with Nava Gram Prayas after a guardian introduces a team to the chairman. Sixteen new Projects are launched with Consults in less than three weeks, making a total of 44, and another 20 Projects are in the Chute. Maliwada HDTs starts with 250 students and more are trying to get in.

Internal: Sandra Robinson visits House and gives a delightful report on the Aurangabad division Consults. House greets Tony Hughes from Great Britain and sends him to Chikhale for engineering advice.

Contradiction: Systematizing and coordinating massive input from State Bank of India, government and private sector, all of which are necessary and available. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Pune College of Engineering agrees to do the village master plan. Chowk (square) beautification maneuver begins with 25 gallons inkind paint and whitewashing stones, making village entry road. Four agricultural demonstration plots are begun. Khadi Village Industry Corporation visits. Guild has 80 present. Herdilia Chemicals donates jeep to Kendur. Three Gram Sabhas are held in Pune Division with three villagers attending from Kendur. Milk distribution for children is begun. Gardener trainees are sent to Pune. Village symbol is painted on the wall in view of the chowk. Plans begin for first anniversary celebration.

Internal: House sends Probakar back to Tasgaon HDP auxiliary after being on loan to Kendur for one month, six to Gram Sabhas and four to Maliwada for council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the vision of Nava Gram Prayas and the anxiety the village experiences over no industry being launched that allows negative leadership fodder. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: The local doctor from Aoti visits Vaviharsh. Teams are sent out to Nasik to inkind materials for the preschool.

Internal: The first divisional project directors meeting of the Bombay Division is held in the divisional office at Vaviharsh. Colleagues arrive from Chikhale, Khambale and Kalambhair HDPs to plan divisional operations and end the meeting with writing a Bombay Division song.

Contradiction: Training and organizing Vaviharsh Village to host four villages visiting the HDP for the first time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a diary scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwahli, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Ragunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliaries. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, grids, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP
External: Project is launched with 80 villagers present full-time. Preschool is immediately with two women volunteers teaching and 30 students participating. Two sugar factories donated 20 pipes for temporary bridge over Khara River, enabling a road to come to Anjangaon when it is built. Ex-villager now living in Baramati came to closing celebration and agreed to donate 2,000 rupees worth of poultry equipment for new poultry farm. One villager will donate rocks for the new dam. Document is cyclostyled in English and Marathi.

Internal: House begins Project battleplanning and decor for auxiliary House, sends out Consult team and Jadhav to Wadegaon Consult, and begins to settle down to doing Nava Gram Prayas or socio-economic development at the local level.

Contradiction: Discerning when "antsiness" is running the Project and when there is really a need to move. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAKALI-TAKALI HDP
External: Loan applications for irrigation pumps for 50 farmers are taken along with applications for electrifying 25 homes. Electricity Board approves plan to provide street lighting.

Internal: Auxiliary House welcomes Brent Winstone for three-day monitoring visit. Project director and assistant director attend first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Establishing guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MALIWADGAON-MALIWADGAON HDP
External: Government sanctions bore well for drinking water purposes. Village donates 10,000 bricks for construction of public sanitation facilities and community buildings. Former landowner of the whole Gangapur Taluka donates his Maliwadgaon residence as auxiliary House and Community Center along with 50 acres for the demonstration farm.

Internal: Auxiliary sends project director, assistant director and three village leaders to attend the first Aurangabad Division Project Directors Meeting in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Training emerging community leaders in methods of guild and stake leadership. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI
External: Week of authorization and funding is highlighted by global team visits and return of UNICEF observer from Maliwada who is greatly excited, particularly by the HDTS.

Internal: Shukla Kumar sojourns in the House while T. M. Kumar goes to HDTS.

Contradiction: Trying to blow up the bridge with one hand, while feeding medicine to a feverish adult with the other and balancing a child on each hip. (Wk. 6)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP
External: Three new pairs of bullocks are purchased with newly received bank loans, in 108 degree heat! One new small temple is built and a rebuilt temple is inaugurated with all staff present in Harrijan stake. Massive invisible face lift continues while 25 full paying members initiate the new cooperative society. Translation of pre-school rituals into

Telegu changes images of teachers. The final sight for the drinking water well is established.

Internal: All auxiliary spend a Sunday of discontinuity in Hyderabad seeing a new Hindi movie and eating a fine meal.

Contradiction: Holding a tension between the necessity of local control and the responsibility to adopt new techniques of operation which will change the out-moded operating image of the village as outlined in the document contradictions. (Wk. 4)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA
External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS
External: House visits with Sri Lanka presidential advisor in relation to HDPs and participation in India HDTS.

Internal: India report and songs by staff headed to HDTS: Australia and reports on turning USA yellow by Vance and Morton enliven the week.

Contradiction: Making speedy progress toward Project set-up when Consult schedule runs out of slide time. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE
External: Visit with Datuk James Ongkili, Deputy Chief Minister of Sabah, results in his decision to take Project proposal directly to the chief minister. Visit with Dale Squires, Peace Corps man working in fisheries department, gives eyes to see what is possible in fishing industry in Serusup. Surprise visit from internal security nets possible consultant and good wishes for success.

Internal: Maneuver timeline is readied for Consult preparation and area prior is sent out.

Contradiction: Preparing and building Consult foundation with enthusiasm before Sabah government gives final approval for the Project. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP
External: Majlis Tetangga (GCF) Malaysia gets launched as two are sent out to Malaysia's east coast on a set-up trek with newly printed materials in hand.

Internal: House experiences both depletion and elation as the LingDjen is sent out to teach in Oombulgurri HDTS and Shankland is sent out to site selection in Ujung Pandang.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on reduction in auxiliary troops to build community consensus to do MTM Week. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP
External: National event greatly influences future of Kelapa Dua, for Adam Malik, one of ICAs original supporters and one whose wife spoke at the Consult, is elected Vice President of Indonesia.

Internal: House celebrates great week of task force planning and setting of date for Completion Celebration for June 10, 1978.

Contradiction: Involving entire village in workday and making it a village event. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know and do and be profound humanness.

Contradiction: Waiting for concrete data before building an implementable battleplan. (Wk. 8)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development trek goes to Manila. House enables Kuh Du E Ri Consult launch and a GWF in Nam Wai.

Internal: Joy Thomas gives a collegium report on GWFs in Area Hong Kong and the progress in Langub and Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Keeping dialogue open so responses do not prevent meeting the practical needs of the zone. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG--NAM WAI HDP

External: All phases show up for village GWF with 50 around the table. Thirty-five pounds of mushrooms are sold in first marketing venture. Two China University graduate students in business commit three summer months to work full time. HDTS: Korea grad says yes to being editor of Nam Wai Hakka History and Village Voice while second grad co-leads major presentation at Polytechnic College. Pilot agrees to overfly village for new P.R. brochure cover photo. In typical weekly turnout, twenty young men do quarter's timeline to enable government funding.

Internal: Mr. Tee and Mr. Habino of Japan impact House in their affirmation of Oyubari and Nam Wai projects, leaving a gift of lacquered coal with emblem. House welcomes Joy Thomas for GWF orchestration.

Contradiction: Increasing momentum of auxiliary and objectifying engagement schemes for anticipated outside summer help with a short ten weeks to HDP completion. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG--HAI OU HDP

External: Three CYF's impact high school and college students and YMCA young people with "Anything's possible" and "I can do it" vision for the future. Hai Ou's new store building is ready to go with a fresh coat of blue and white paint.

Internal: The House welcomes Mark Jewell and Kim Rafos for a week of CYF set up and a breath of fresh air for the house.

Contradiction: Walking through sticky mud towards a clear vision. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: House launches Area Hong Kong Yellow Submarine Maneuver to color the Philippines yellow by June with war room board listing "yellow bullion" (funding/authorization), "yellow papers" (materials), "yellow birds" (staff), and "yellow fever" (set-up/implementation). The three-week 66 forum blitz is called Yellow Frenzy.

Internal: Five-day holiday for Philippine national elections allows House three-day quarter planning while hosting Brian Smith (Canada via Langub to Cano Negro), Sandra Blaik (Australia to Sudtonggan), Don and Janet Baker (New York via Murrin Bridge), Joy Thomas (Chicago) and Art Rowe

(Hong Kong).

Contradiction: Tenaciously doing the nitty-gritty to accomplish the big picture. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Visit with Koumingtang Party Chairman in Keelung County in North Taiwan uncovers government level invitation to do another HDP in Taiwan.

Internal: Metro colleagues work on format of a new ICA brochure for Taiwan while facility search continues.

Contradiction: Getting indigenous leadership in Taiwan into the depth struggle of global participation. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU--SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Sorghum harvest brings Sudtonggan's first dry-season commercial crop. First two village toilets are finished and look better than auxiliary's. The campaign to cover 21 wells and install pumps is two-thirds completed. Four health care workers return from 10 spirit-filled days at Langub HDP health caretakers training, wide-eyed with stories of stake meetings and the health fair, and surprised at how much they know.

Internal: Study of Kawangware two year completion celebration gives impetus and insights to upcoming World's Fair.

Contradiction: Turning the village from the image of socio-economic development to making the village the most beautiful in the world. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO--LANGUB HDP

External: US \$2000 worth of bulgar wheat arrives through Catholic Relief Services. Sports carnival is held with sitio Kauswagan coming in first for the second time. Parent Teachers Association meets with Barangay Council to prepare petition and resolution for the opening of high school in June.

Internal: Second session of RS-I refreshes memories and recalls identity.

Contradiction: Structuring participation so that it is possible across the huge geographic area of Langub. (Wk. 6)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Town Meeting continues to gain momentum with the publication of an article in the "Tokyo Weekender" most popular societal paper in Asia which reaches 10,000 subscribers.

Internal: Symbolic life continues with a small number of troops, while third Japanese sojourner moves in.

Contradiction: Maintaining the stance of victory in the midst of TM and GWF steering committees taking off for vacation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU--KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Village takes another step in global relatedness as it sends 12 of its leaders to Kuh Du E Ri for the Consult. Preparation for experimental planting is begun with the cleaning of the vinyl house and plowing of the field. Preschool attendance takes another leap as ten new children are recruited. First yes to Oyubari ITI becomes solid when Professor Yang Sang Ick requests invitation letter from Japan.

Contradiction: Continuing to be innovative when all lights are red. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Task forces hold village leaders meeting in Kuh Du E Ri for consult set-up planning with the new village hall 80% completed, hold HRM in Seoul for 45 young people, visit religious orders seeking inkind office space in Seoul, receive development gift from Chartered Bank, mail 100 invitations to the Consult to companies in Seoul, and attend dinner given by Mrs. Lee Chul Kyung.

Internal: House sends out Kim Won Ho and four regional colleagues to the Academy in Chicago, sends out the William Salmon family to Chicago, welcomes Hong Kong Centrum representative and enjoys first ecclesiola of the quarter with new construct from Chicago on the first week of the quarter.

Contradiction: Operating effectively out of local laws and global principles. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House holds first GWF brunch. Mark Jewell and Kim Rafos help to train local college students for future CYFs in Quarter II.

Internal: Staff hunts some more for a new house that is both cheap and accessible.

Contradiction: Using time to best advantage. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: The Social Education Director of Women's Activities in Osaka gets the location and newspaper publicity for the Osaka GWF. The same morning three women take enablement responsibility for the course. All this came at the same time as three separate news articles introduce three separate GWF's.

May 5, Children's Day in Japan, Jeremiah Shaw and Adia Hanson march in parade in Yubari City and go to Buddhist Temple for celebration and then tour of Yubari.

Internal: Painting of collegium room transforms room with coal dust from long winter now gone. CS-1 lectures and workshop, timelines and study of Bonhoeffer's "Community" provide setting for individual/corporate depth reflection. Three youth from Oyubari show up for a visit.

Contradiction: Completing tasks and keeping the momentum going while taking advantage of beautiful weather for beautification. (Wk 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Newcastle, N.S.W., Global Women's Forum has in attendance at event locally set-up 65 women who establish national and international authorization.

Internal: House sends out Margaret Oakley to Australia HDTs and hosts David White on Development circuit.

Contradiction: Defining maneuvers with boldness that radicalizes the demand to release frozen images and preconditioned responses in order to enable participation in all campaign arenas. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Second \$1000 week in a row enables the biggest month ever - more than twice as big as any month previous. Youth receive \$125 for the Oombulgurri Youth Trek. House mails report for Phase I of the Community Meeting: West Australia Campaign.

Internal: House sends out Augusta Jayasekera to HDTs and John Cock to Canberra and welcomes Kathleen Rees.

Contradiction: Building and caring for the networks with the image of being engaged in the edge task of our time. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Key people visit for Murrin Bridge Consult.

Internal: David is sent on area Development assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional responsibility as areal demands shift. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Press reporters arrive in Oombulgurri just in time for breakfast with the community in the community kitchen. They hold a nationally viewed press conference with the Aboriginals to hear what they really have to say about mining on their land. The excitement of the day lasts through the night with a midnight trip to refuel the water pump. John Huelin, director of Aboriginal Legal Aid, comes to see if Oombulgurri wants his services and what it expects from the mining companies.

Contradiction: Building appropriate House operations that utilize the gift of being scattered over the area for the next quarter. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

Internal: Guests from Chicago Nexus provide the inspiration to fulfill the long-felt need to paint the hallway of the KITCO house.

Contradiction: Motivating local leaders to persevere in door-to-door recruiting for guild and stake. (Wk. 6)s

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Visit with Governor Peter T. Coleman in American Samoa expands HDP authorization framing.

Internal: House travels to American Samoa for business, pleasure and HDP authorization.

Contradiction: Using authorization to effect village decision to do the HDP. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Asherton townspeople meet and spend a large part of the meeting discussing housing possibilities for the auxiliary. City council signs letter of invitation for HDP. Community youth see slide show and write Asherton song.

Internal: House moves first carload of boxes to Asherton.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Saturday work day on "The Street Where You Live" sees 14 lawns mowed and house painted-bringing the total to eight, 100 more shrubs planted, residence signs with family name and house number and Pace airstrip mowed. Forty-nine adults and fifth and sixth graders travel to New Orleans to be impacted by history of the South through visits to a wax museum and a dramatic trip up the Mississippi on the SS Natchez. Internal: House hosts Kansas/Nebraska strike force and sends

out McCabes to South Illinois for site selection.

Contradiction: Maintaining the pace while packing and passing the baton to Kansas City and Iowa HDP. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: The Kansas City metro is scattered in five states: Louisiana (completion), Nebraska (setting up 35 TM's), Kansas (16 left to set up), Ohio (State Agency on Aging set-up) and Missouri (Afternoon at the Institute).

Internal: Yard cleaning and flower and garden planting engage House in rite of spring.

Internal: Painting of the Daily Office room, sky blue with white trim is followed by inkind Holiday Inn dinner and movie celebration.

Contradiction: Covering all bases and packing in another quarter between May 15 and June 30. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: ICA receives invitation for Project in Lorimer from board of Lorimer Boosters Club which includes the mayor less than one week after site is selected. House discovers that Lorimer is in New Hope Township!! Four community women have already volunteered to help start a preschool before the Consult. Iowa Hunger Campaign again covers the state, netting one more village adopted and several others possible with a total of five adopted to date.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Two churches are impacted with India slides as they decide to adopt villages.

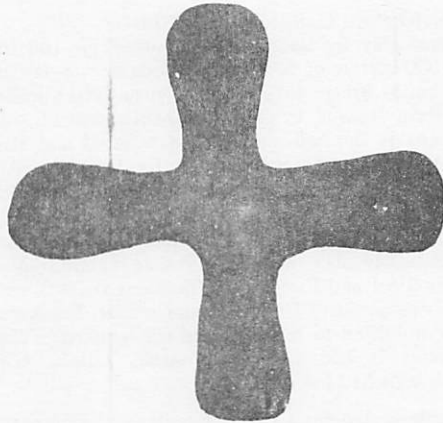

Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANJANGAON - ANJANGAON HDP

External: Three new pairs of bullocks are purchased with newly received bank loans, in 108 degree heat! One new small temple is built and a rebuilt temple is inaugurated with all staff present in Harrijan stake. Massive invisible face lift continues while 25 full paying members initiate the new cooperative society. Translation of pre-school rituals into Telegu changes images of teachers. The final sight for the drinking water well is established.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Saturday work day on "The Street Where You Live" sees 14 lawns mowed and house painted-bringing the total to eight, 100 more shrubs planted, residence signs with family name and house number and Pace airstrip mowed. Contradiction: Expanding the collegial network in order to do an end run on time, troops and money. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: House orchestrates its first Arkansas Town Meeting. Tennessee Jamboree has a great week of Town Meetings. One team has three on one day with 255 total attendance. Week brings in \$506 in local contributions. Towns are saying TMs have been the greatest community events they have ever had.

Internal: Last minute inkind pitch nets Italian dinner in Memphis with an interview with the ad manager of the restaurant chain who asks us to meet his top executive to see about helping Tennessee, Arkansas and Alabama TMs. House travels to Nashville for the last debriefing/celebration before the troops turn to Alabama.

Contradiction: Creating eventfulness that motivates a victorious stance. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA
