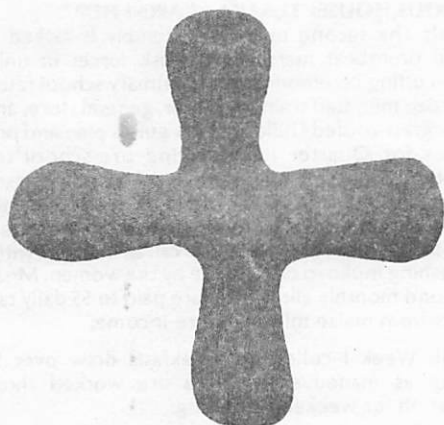

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: House sends monthly area campaign newsletter to 600. Australian colleague Liza Todd gets "Old Girl" network dancing to awakening tunes, especially the National Catholic Women's League and the Women's Royal Volunteer Service.

Internal: Kim Won Ho and Robert Johnson arrive to bring House to its assigned strength plus one.

Contradiction: Acquiring materials for completion of the powerhouse by December 15th. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Livingston TM is a winner, catalyzing anchor point of one stronghold: Grampian Community Education offers two of their staff to train and do a series of TMs in the north, while two other communities on their own say "yes" to dates in November.

Internal: Ruth Dyhr arrives for two weeks Development/TM circuit bringing stories of India.

Contradiction: Engaging new and old colleagues in the awakening of their surrounding communities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Community gives unanimous "yes" to Friendly Society and four new potential leaders volunteer to do membership drive. The 11th edition of the *Vision* is eagerly read with its detailed reports on store and building preparation. Stake visiting uncovers enthusiastic local photographer. Local housewife starts work as volunteer Project secretary. TM circuiting breaks loose neighboring village leaders who bubble with excitement.

Internal: House celebrates society meeting with wine and cake and later with great singing at the club with beer.

Contradiction: Building journey models for local leaders as Project accelerates on several fronts. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: A Development person from Brussels Nexus participates in re-stimulation of Manchester Region Development network. Sheffield calls reveal readiness to help on the part of one of the nation's largest candy manufacturers. Week's activity realizes 500 USD.

Internal: Workday on House grounds and external appearance demonstrates the power of Religious House empowerment.

Contradiction: Moving comprehensively on all missional fronts in the face of immediate practical demands. (Wk. 4)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: A week of Development results in five proposals being submitted for 22,400 francs (over \$5,000) and \$200 deposited from a long-awaited but unexpected source.

Internal: House puts crucial collegium decor in place in time for Week II study of the four RS-1 theologians.

Contradiction: Moving with the momentum of the present advantages without being overwhelmed by the practicals. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Three Community Forums are held in three new provinces that demonstrate the helpfulness of new workbook, the possibility of good attendance and the possibility of doing quality meetings. House hosts 55 from the Rome English-speaking Methodist Church in Termine. They deeply address the villagers and offer valuable technical and financial assistance to the Termine industries.

Internal: Saturday night celebration is held with the whole House present for the first time in two weeks, including two Italian sojourners.

Contradiction: Keeping a step ahead of going 150 kilometers an hour. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Town Meetings in all five stakes culminating in a community assembly on Saturday triples the guild membership and brings new urgency for cooperation among the stakes.

Internal: House sends out troops on a three-region circuit to visit recent ITI grads and participates in the ordination of Tony Amoako-Atta.

Contradiction: Building a workable weekly rhythm that shifts community interest into engagement. (Wk. 4)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Framing visits towards authorization and residency in Belgium highlight the week.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality reveals talented configuration of troops.

Contradiction: Creating the next steps in the Belgium frame that keep moving on time. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Legal framing visits and two Town Meetings, plus re-manuevering session with Global Operations Centrum give heightened clarity on coming weeks.

Internal: Invitations are sent out for the Panchayat Evening at the Institute.

Contradiction: Creating story that pulls authorization, financial support and energy into one campaign thrust. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Dorpsdag in Bentelo with over 200 participants is led by eight local workshop leaders. Amsterdam—Noord group sets date for training of leaders for November 19 meeting. New brochure is ready to print with eight Guardians listed as advisors, and 15 Guardians set to meet during Panchayat visit.

Internal: House celebrates Dorpsdag victory with inkind paper goods, inkind bread, and 20 inkind McDonald's hamburgers.

Contradiction: Broadcasting across the Netherlands the story of the great happening of Bentelo Dorpsdag. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Circuit to Ruhr Valley visiting many old friends from last year's Town Meetings recruits families to spend week between Christmas and New Year' at the Frankfurt House. Two pastors drop by to discuss their planned trip to the USA next spring and summer so that they can arrange for Academy and GRA participation.

Internal: Paul Dyher comes to visit on a Development trip, bringing helpful reports and insights from his stay in Nadlapur, India.

Contradiction: Finding the means to compare, evaluate and recreate models with circuit teams passing briefly, schedule getting fuller, and quarter getting shorter. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Kreuzberg Ost Development brochure mock-up is done. First of stake Town Meetings is held successfully on Falkensteinstrasse—a 3-hour construct. Community person is now printing *Laterne* newspaper. Second Saturday afternoon *Information Abend* is held for training community people in movement methods. Three yeases on setting up Town Meetings

across Berlin are received. Business Development letters are sent to 69 local Kreuzberg industries with great cover letter from Andrus Electronics, a strong contributor.

Internal: Hans-Peter Brunner is received as an intern at House Church after one year sojourn.

Contradiction: Finding time to keep corporate body up-to-date when all the troops are hopping. (Wk. 5)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: The second quarterly assembly is kicked off with colorful drumbeat march of all task forces in uniform to ribbon-cutting ceremonies at the primary school foundation, new maize mill, staff training center, general store, and huge, circular grass-roofed Guild Hall. Six guilds plan and present 30 victories for Quarter II. Following pre-school teachers' graduation, the Iron Man award, and Assembly consensus on guild leaders, the goats and pigs, pit-roasted by the farm trainees are delivered to the five stake dining areas for a plenty-for-all 300 feast. Drumbeats call all to dance with barrels of refreshing mukoyo drink made by the women. Meanwhile, the second monthly allowances are paid to 55 daily task force workers from maize mill and store income.

Internal: Week I collegium breakfasts draw over 50 each morning as maneuver methods are worked through in preparation for weekend planning.

Contradiction: Finding ways to undergird new community-wide engagement in the stake-a-day building of the primary school. (Wk. 4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Wedge team presence affords opportunity for major authorization visits in the public and private sectors which set stage for major support of ICA work in Egypt.

Internal: New auxiliary arrivals Tim and Sue Wegner and Nurul Fazria are quickly absorbed into the thick of the social demonstration battle through serious deliberation on HDP completion led by the Wedge team.

Contradiction: Finding ways to work with the local government bureaucracy. (Wk. 4)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: A great workday is held at new nursery school with parents of children and others who cleaned the area, set up play equipment, dug sand box and erected a sign that clearly states that this is a community school. Global Guardian, John Clark from London, arrives unexpectedly and takes tour of both Kawangware and Kamweleni Human Development Projects. Following quarterly planning session, community leaders are entertained by a magician who has a position at university but sees himself caring more directly for local man through his skill as magician.

Internal: House shares an exciting week with Charles Hahn and Ray Spencer bringing two Houses together for a fine session on the future out of the present situation and determining what is required for this year.

Contradiction: Looking at the practical "hows" behind all-consuming vision. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Kamweleni is energized by community meeting led by community leader Mzee Ndolo and a moving speech by blind elder Mzee Kalai. A massive step is made in framing as a high-powered community delegation visits five top level

government officials in one day, and District Commissioner assures full support. KHDP is invited to serve on two district-wide planning committees to determine spending of 200 million shillings. District Commissioner gives nod to Village Meetings in every village in the Machakos Integrated Development Project—200 villages. Kamweleni HDP is selected as a demonstration health program for the Machakos Integrated Development Project area, and a commitment is made for a resident Clinical Officer, paramedic with advanced training, to staff community dispensary. Government commits staff and medications for an immediate interim weekly clinic in the Health Outpost and a community-wide malaria suppression campaign.

Internal: House sings for six hours all the Other World, Love and Pop/Folk songs, in a marathon troop revival.

Contradiction: Enabling every auxiliary to stand on death ground. (Wk. 4)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Preparations are made for Continental Council. The completion of 20 Consults is celebrated. The opening of the ninth HDS and the arrival of 29 Ambar Charkha (yarn) spinning machines for Chikhale are portents of victory.

Internal: The Order celebrates the marriage of Madan Tribuwan and Ruby Salve in Bombay.

Contradiction: Positioning the circuits for HDS recruitment and new campaign while consolidating long range planning. (Wk. 5)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: This week lays the groundwork for launching the buffer projects. The cities of Modinagar and Gaziabad are visited. Potential villages, sponsoring companies and authorization are located. Development receives a request from a UN agency for a proposal to do a project in Bihar (Calcutta Area) and receives letter from the Indian Government supporting the ICA.

Internal: Personnel, decor and site are all strengthened by the arrival of Jon and Maureen Jenkins for sojourn enroute to Sri Lanka, and John Patterson and Vinod Parekh working on Development and authorization.

Contradiction: Determining site and solving practicals of moving to the village. (Wk. 3)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Personal invitations are delivered to metro colleagues during visitation campaign to attend two upcoming metro events. First edition of area UPDATE is mailed.

Internal: House opens bank account, symbolizing to establishment that ICA office in Calcutta is serious about intent to work in this area.

Contradiction: Shifting established operating images on other side of this week's Continental Council. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Old colleagues are tapped for assistance in Nexus self-support maneuvers.

Internal: House sends out Phyllis Mielke to Bubun and Bontoa Consults, and welcomes visitors, Wegners and Jill England.

Contradiction: Bringing corporate stew to decision and moving on it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Several visas are approved, including a first—a six-week tourist visa for Nexus personnel.

Internal: House welcomes Jaime Vergara and John Cock, and sends out Kathleen Rees to Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Speeding up the implementation of new assignments. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: All three tractors are in working condition, busy plowing, planting, and spreading fertilizer on demonstration plots. The Pasar (village market) opens on Wednesday and is sold out of all fish and vegetables every day. House moves 30 metal drums, tractors, and two unrepairable jeeps out of ICA front yard and down to Agricultural Complex. Singapore Development strengthens coop power and goes on 16 appointments, tying together British company contacts, systematizing data on contacts, following up on past contacts and generally "flogging up a froth." Follow up on a January appointment in Penang prompts Kampulan Barkat representative site visit on Friday and promise of M\$1,000. Saturday Lam Soon site visit prompts M\$1,350 check on Monday morning. Two people, in one day, write a four page \$31,000 proposal for the Canadian High Commissioner who indicates morley forthcoming after site visit in two weeks.

Internal: House sends out Rob Jennings Teats and Joani Fleshman to Serusup after completing Serusup Document publication in both English and Malay with all parts inked and help of secretary typing 80 pages of Malay over the week-end.

Contradiction: Getting the news out to total community that the flurry of activity they see is a signal of Sungai Lui getting ready to show itself to the world and not just because the Canadian High Commissioner is coming. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Egg production from first chicken house increases to 146 per day. The second and third houses are established and two more are planned. Manager of Charoen Popkhand

Chicken Feed Company promises to donate 200 chickens, feed and medicine for both Bontoa and Bubun HDPs. Villagers cooperate with film crew to prepare a TV documentary on Kelapa Dua for TV Republic of Indonesia. One hundred fifty attend Friday night guild meeting to see global slide show.

Internal: Guests include Len Hockley on his way to Bontoa and Ellen Rebstock from Singapore Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Catalyzing new village participation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Bulk buying of rice by 14 shops in Bubun is accomplished with funds being set aside as capital to initiate village cooperative. Business guild is taking form out of this activity, and is extending to sugar, coffee and cooking oil.

Internal: Work begins on spacious auxiliary kitchen, which incorporates a water catchment system to release clean water as well as doing simple demonstration of catchment for the village.

Contradiction: Enabling appointed village leadership to assume real leadership while encouraging grassroots leadership also to emerge. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: New found Guardian, Mr. Chris Dagg, INCO, visits village, commits four consultants, used office equipment, beds, engineering assistance and funding. Drainage ditch workday engages village youth and Emerging Generation.

Internal: Auxiliary moves into the oldest house in Bontoa.

Contradiction: Developing the finesse and clout to graciously cut bureaucratic corners. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nexus sends out Tony Elizondo to preparatory phase of HDTs in Sudtonggan as Area Hong Kong gears up for next step forward in strategic Project Expansion.

Internal: Ecclesiola study intrigues the Nexus with "familiar ring" of author's poetry and therefore elicits participation in the quarter study.

Contradiction: Moving beyond the immediacies of getting started to building the sustaining momentum for the quarter. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The second round of negotiations between the Nam Wai Foundation Ltd. and land development companies takes place as the final day for completing sale of all individually owned land to the Foundation approaches. At the end of a Development trek, \$1,000 USD is received, two checks are in the mail and one large donation is promised. Unrelenting visibility campaign has villagers planting flowers and removing weeds, with volunteers arising from stake meetings.

Internal: A study of *Our Corporation Vocation* catalyzes creative reflection on both individuals' journeys and the profound function of an order in history.

Contradiction: Maintaining a long range vision without being swallowed up by the short range advantages. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Five villagers, the pre-school teacher, and two county officials depart for Sudtonggan (the first trip out of the country for all but one).

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Singer commits \$5,000 for 1979 expansion. Development receives \$6,000 in-hand Week 9.

Internal: House sends out Judy Albers and Russ Wheelock to North American assignments.

Contradiction: Grasping the real challenge of this year while experiencing the do-ability of our assigned task. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Hai Ou HDP reports are mailed to 100 corporation and individual donors. Framing team visits Ministry of Interior and Cathay Life Insurance Company.

Internal: Peter Hu's granddaughter, 1 month old, visits House.

Contradiction: Completing authorization visits in Taipei while simultaneously launching cooperative support of government for Town Meeting campaign. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Governor Gullas of Cebu commits water systems for the four cluster villages. In one week three of the four villages are selected and 36 people sign up for the Training School. Severe typhoon weather does not hinder the Durok Parents Meeting: 44 mothers meet, elect officers and plan field trip. Manila permeator becomes sales rep of Sudtonggan Craft Industry, selling to her English students.

Internal: House fills with pre-HDTS staff, and four village families enlist volunteer help (college students) who are setting up Training Center.

Contradiction: Developing a story that holds urgency of the upcoming cluster experiment in midst of the non-urgent story of the society. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New quarter begins with large community assembly, and establishes consensus to have weekly community meetings. Demonstration Japanese earthbank kiln for brick industry is completed. Marketing and research team to expand sewing industry hits the road. Frame for community nursery is completed and seeds obtained. Yearly Langub fiesta is celebrated with cultural show from the University of Mindanao. Construction for the Training Center/staff house begins anew. A second day care center with 31 children opens in Mojon stake. City Health doctors begin regular visits with 61 patients on the first day.

Internal: House welcomes Ben and Leoncita Potot and seven children, Rudy and Miguela Tero and two children, Godofredo and Dalinay Estorgio and six children, and Susan Amistoso from Sudtonggan as new staff for the year.

Contradiction: Getting a regular supply system into existence. (Wk. 5)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: The third semi-annual Guardian meeting creates plans for launching national Town Meetings. The GWF task force meets to set first GWF date for the year. House prior makes a trek to two provinces and sets up one TM with two more possibilities.

Internal: The House hosts the Town Meeting Task Force and a House Church with seven guests.

Contradiction: Doing the priorities in the midst of the many things that need to be done. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: House begins recatalyzing all programs in the village with maneuver writing and timelining for Quarter II. The

Kwangyung II Primary School holds its annual Cultural Festival with fan dancing, corporate games and races.

Internal: House is made new with rearranged furniture and new decor.

Contradiction: Catching the village leadership up in urgent engagement during busy harvesting season. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Following visit with the county chief, permission is expected early next week for a community center which will house preschool, barber shop, bath house, and community store. Villagers cast the cement blocks and decide to contribute 10,000 won per household.

Internal: House reaches full size as Park Si Won and La Roche family arrive from Area Council.

Contradiction: Stretching an already full staff to do task, with two members in hospital for two weeks. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Circuit to Shikoku sets up TM in Kochi for November (six more prefectures to go). Six religious orders are key in quick community set-up of TM. Ann Ziegenmeier gives speech on youth and future responsibility to 1,500 students at high school where she teaches.

Internal: New English teaching jobs begin with more jobs offered.

Contradiction: Strategizing a yes for Development appointments and TM set-up in prefectures not yet won. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Town Meeting circuit preparation at ecclesiola sodality, and circuit to Wakayama get five regional colleagues' beings into *Turning Japan Gold*. Circuit to three prefectures nets yeses for two Town Meetings. In a fourth prefecture, colleagues pursue set up through government structures. A GWF date is set for November 10, and LENS mailing is out.

Internal: Joy of missional community shows up in house cleaning, clerical tasks, and teaching as House spends one day dancing the closet shuffle and celebrates at neighborhood Chinese restaurant.

Contradiction: Claiming weekly victories without a completed quarter's calendar. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: GWF meeting with Sapporo church women sets date for GWF pedagogy. Michael Shaw is sent out on TM circuit and reports date set in November for Fukushima City. Mr. Tonosaki is sent out to Japan Guardians Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Oyubari House hosts 14 guests for informal evening on Saturday night; includes drop-in from Switzerland, making 24th nation to visit, OHDP.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to Oyubari as a demonstration. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Visit to national office of Lions International opens possibility of CMA support. Week II PSUs set up designs for quarter's Guardian involvement and new meshing of external and internal mission.

Internal: House hosts Bill Newkirk en route to Jakarta forestry conference, and colleagues from Melbourne, Murrin Bridge, Canberra and Brisbane.

Contradiction: Rebuilding momentum and establishing other beachheads. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Letter to Minister for Community Welfare commends joint government decision to assume responsibility for the continued development of Oombulgorri and succeeds in getting the minister to correct erroneous press statements about excessive expenditure. The presence of Bill Newkirk opens up a new network—timber/forestry—when it is discovered that top local businessman staff had unsuccessfully been trying to see will be at the same international convention as Bill in Jakarta.

Internal: House hosts eight guests: five Oombulgorri leaders, two area troops and the Newkirks' mum.

Contradiction: Rebuilding the story of an historical task, encompassing the victory of Oombulgorri and the focus of the GCF campaign into a renewed, singular thrust. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGORRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lbs. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: The first RS-1 in Australia in two years yields 21 around the table and is unanimously hailed as a highly relevant formation event that still raises the right questions. A meeting is held with the Marialta Trust about a CYF proposal.

Internal: Regional colleagues hold workday to transform collegium room and garden.

Contradiction: Getting on the road with all maneuvers. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: *Campaign News* is mailed to regional colleagues. Development effort nets \$1,505 in hand for Community Forums in Victoria. Boxes of shoes are delivered to Murrin Bridge to initiate token wage system for market garden workers.

Internal: Sam Watson, aboriginal leader from Brisbane, visits for half a day on his way to Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Getting on with the mission while responding to area crises. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House visits assistant to Federal Minister for Environment, Housing and Community Development, who is delighted with community meeting reports from three states, and offers to report ICA community work to other government departments including immigration. Canberra colleagues go out to work at Murrin Bridge for five days on "Paint-a-House."

Internal: House sends out Banks to Melbourne on Development, and Holcombe to Murrin Bridge to plan satellites from there.

Contradiction: Keeping futuristic authorization calls going during time when immediate authorization is crucial. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Queensland CMA and HDP front end funding proposals are drawn up with inked photocopies. Status reports are sent to Area Houses.

Internal: House is reorganized to accommodate doubling of staff.

Contradiction: Making major shifts without jarring vision. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: First quarter ends with games day celebration of the first six months of MBHDP. New quarter begins with wide and enthusiastic participation in rabbit and kangaroo hunts. Research and demonstration of tanning as a potential industry is begun.

Internal: Auxiliary enjoys visiting task force of Melbourne colleagues during a long holiday week-end while painting exterior of house and beautifying yard space.

Contradiction: Giving form to a community-initiated 13-week plan. (Wk. 4)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Key new decisions are manifested as all TASC enrollees score high on first accounting test in course offered by CPA firm. All stakes decide to participate in clearing and planting of first community garden. Stake leaders decide to hold cooking class on same night as guild meeting so many people can taste the results and learn more nutrition.

Internal: House dimaxes a hard afternoon's work on creation of new space and repairs to enable family moves by relaxing with pizza and an in-house movie.

Contradiction: Capturing budding excitement of new contacts in the stakes with the appropriate offer of engagement. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: With four weeks to go to Consult, Prime Minister says "go do a village," and high chief of Salani suggests "Salani will be a model for Western Samoa."

Internal: Everyone auditions for role of poetry reader at ecclesiola which comes as a breath of fresh air amidst ambiguity of the task.

Contradiction: Practically grounding the village yes without getting trapped in *Messiah* image. (Wk. 4)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: House ensures saturation momentum with three more TMs, held in predominantly Mexican-American communities around Fresno.

Internal: First regional TM newsletter of its kind gets produced and ready for mailing with consistent help from regional colleague enabling in Day 1.

Contradiction: Singing in the rain while soaked, lacking strong-holding umbrellas! (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—FITCHGROVE HDP

External: Regional Health Department backs the new expanded water system 100%. CETA approves \$59,000 grant of seven positions, subject to Congressional approval. Two Town Meetings are held; three more are set up plus two special events. Two community meetings, community leaders' breakfast and businessmen's lunch reinforce community involvement. The adobe brick industry gets affirmation from C.U. research group.

Internal: House sends out Noemi Castillo and Margaret Ennis to Pace preschool training weekend and Paula Laiewski and Reuben Enriquez to the Pisinemo Consult.

Contradiction: Intentionalizing the stake dynamic in the midst of implementing the total tactics. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Cusick is on-stage with award from three county Panorama Land as the community "showing exemplary

courage and foresight in meeting the difficult challenges of nourishing the life-enriching values of the American small town."

Internal: Auxiliary out on self-support and saturation leads to Religious House being used solely by community to do necessary tasks.

Contradiction: Creating model for internal systems and other Project issues to support economic development (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Two weeks of visitation begins in greater Seattle with cadre, and a full week of preparing materials for building strongholds before forays continue.

Internal: Juli Haman earns three credits from high school for Town Meeting work.

Contradiction: Shifting from yellowing counties to building strongholds leaves us with no image of what stronghold win is. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: House and metro colleagues learn how to take leaps in saturation strategy as LA and San Bernardino maneuvers are kicked off with gatherings, while Bakersfield is in completion stage.

Internal: Collegium on Tulare County maneuver breaks House loose to see possibility of engagement for all.

Contradiction: Configuring local troops in a way that gives them permission to take responsibility for set-up. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Outhouses are painted by village children in preparation for the Consult.

Internal: Mission priest leads House on tour around the district, pointing out plants, wild burros and remote villages, some of which have been recently abandoned.

Contradiction: Containing anxieties about Consult logistics so they do not detract from eliciting community engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Appointments are set with Montana Power and Mountain Bell, past Town Meeting supporters, to catalyze statewide support for Montana Town Meetings.

Internal: House launches new self-support strategy and prepares two apartments for rental this November.

Contradiction: Catalyzing people into revealing their passion, so that their care might be released and effectively channeled into missional priorities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP
External: Beautiful local beadwork appears, starting a new department at Cannon Ball store. The Executive Committee of the Corporation Board hears Joe Two Bear's speech from Pisinemo Consult.

Internal: A crowded Week II includes Jabberwocky at ecclesiola, house painting, tunnel building, and a night on the town in Bismarck.

Contradiction: Moving the community through action to creative thinking. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Eight regional colleagues travel to Crowley County Town Meeting. House submits curriculum to government organization for Sterling, Colorado saturation maneuver.

Internal: Self-support win and first full saturation maneuver are celebrated with steak dinner, charades and a spirited card game, Nerts!

Contradiction: Applying the learnings from Crowley County practically in future maneuvers. (Wk. 5)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: McKenzie Valley saturation maneuver reports Inuvik CYF of 150 grade 10, 11, 12 students and CFC of 15 at Tuktoyaktuk on the Arctic Ocean.

Internal: House plans and prepares for Thanksgiving feast in midst of rethinking maneuvers and anticipating the Thomsons' arrival.

Contradiction: Discerning next steps in region without knowing when next saturation maneuvers will be launched. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Williams Lake saturation maneuver is going strong with four CFCs, one GWF, one CYF and Assembly location set.

Internal: Area prior and movement colleagues move House while maneuver is going on 350 miles to the North.

Contradiction: Orchestrating House systems, colleague care and metro circuits with engagement in the Three Campaigns. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: The village of Minto, Alaska, 120 miles northwest of Fairbanks by road, 20 minutes by small plane, decides to become the HDP demonstration sign in Alaska.

Internal: The search for Dunne's *The Way of All The Earth* leads the House on a merry chase, ending in a pastor colleague's study where the only copy in the state of Alaska is found.

Contradiction: Standing in the midst of a totally new universe, creating new maneuvers to get the gears in motion. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Development team impacts colleagues with first-hand report from India and builds maneuver with House to win Quarter II Development funding challenge.

Internal: Arrival of new Canadian Human Development Projects brochure symbolizes new phase in national consciousness of Those Who Care.

Contradiction: Learning to use small forces effectively. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: First stake meeting is held with Global Slide Show. Colleagues attend Guardians Consult, two for the first time.

Internal: Interior doors are painted and fire exit installed, as first touch of snow arrives.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering quickly and effectively in midst of troop shifts and priority changes. (Wk. 5)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Alice maneuver team returns home triumphant. Week is spent evaluating and setting up next tri-micro saturation. House is invited to Riverside Civic Club (Houston neighborhood) to help plan their second Town Meeting. Metro circuits are initiated with Week II trip to Austin.

Internal: Richard Kauffman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Guild meeting is held with potluck dinner. Thirty-five community residents hear reports by recent arrivals from Pisinemo Consult and Guardians Consult. Tim Lush from Houston and Roger Marsh from Oklahoma City also attend. Saturday workday sees old house on main road torn down with gusto.

Internal: House celebrates week and workday by going to drive-in theatre to see the movie *Hooper*.

Contradiction: Utilizing effectively the present advantages and tremendous momentum the Project has going. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: A workday with colleagues from San Antonio and New Jersey is held to complete initial day care renovation. One House member attends day long child care/health/first aid symposium in Uvalde, Texas. A \$400 proposal for toys and recreation equipment is submitted to Community Services Administration.

Internal: House sends three of its staff and two community residents to Dallas for four-day VISTA training session.

Contradiction: Keeping troops from dropping through the cracks between planning and action. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: The Ponca City maneuver begins rolling in a big way with initial town visits, feedback on easy set-up for TM, GCF and GWF in tri-micro towns. Two-thirds of the food is inkinded and lodging is secured.

Internal: Guardians close deal on old Religious House facility and House receives keys for the new facility.

Contradiction: Forging the new role of the Regional House and the off-field general. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Saturation maneuver *Bonnie and Clyde* captures a committee of 11 men and women, including three mayors, who will speak up for ICA if the going gets rough. A maneuver brochure and cover letter are created and the Community Education coordinator from Burkburnett calls to request a Town Meeting for 200 people on November 18th.

Internal: Guardians and House members attend *A Chorus Line* at the State Fair of Texas.

Contradiction: Passing over quickly yet smoothly from battle preparation to hand-to-hand combat, assured that the field is set for victory. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Diplomats visit from U.S. State Department, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka, and indicate Pace is the most exciting visit of their trek in the U.S. Community leadership decisions are symbolized over dinner and investiture, including presentation of journals and guild pins. Survey is launched by community. Public hearing on city budget affirms consensus of support for mayor's public improvements strategy.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences long-awaited reality of backstage role.

Contradiction: Undergirding vocational decisions of key leadership and enabling long-range planning and motivity methods. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Assembly is held, signaling the first maneuver completion.

Internal: Saturday work day with many regional colleagues helps complete two thirds of House painting and ends with a Guardian celebration at dinner.

Contradiction: Enabling all troops to take total responsibility for the complete mission, while doing a fine job of particular assignments. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: House continues circuiting with four TMs set and working in Tennessee and 16 TM dates set in Jackson, Mississippi stronghold. Global Development workshops ways to raise \$6,000 before Christmas.

Internal: Development team, Dan Tuecke and Elsa Batica, help begin the Command Post for Development events.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering to avoid repeating the same maneuver in visiting towns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Carter Country Call is highlighted by workshop leader training; massive publicity campaign is conducted by Montezuma in attempt to top the neighboring town's 300; in-kind tops \$100, and Week II foray goes to six communities, including Plains, with a number of TMs and GWF possible. Meeting with Atlanta Boys Club secures 13 CYFs plus an assembly for the two weeks.

Internal: Ecclesiola night at the movies is highlighted by Nova, which lays out what life in outer space would look like.

Contradiction: Maintaining set-up thrust for this maneuver and set-up for the next, while moving into implementation phase. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: First experiment with saturation results in four events in Gibson HDP in five days with 75 adults and 160 children participating. Visiting impact team expands staff's imagination with global stories and reports.

Internal: Order Youth impact House with musical program in sodality.

Contradiction: Concretizing guild plans. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: A phone call from a Jewish synagogue in Miami inquires about Imaginal Education. Fourth Task Force on churchwide education uses maneuver methods in setting up tasks for the next quarter.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a fine event as prolegomena discussion draws a response of "they don't teach things like this in school, do they?" from one of the youth and conversation on creative tension informs and heals.

Contradiction: Turning the vulnerability of "working alone" from paralysis to purposeful action. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Paper and printing for 50,000 TM workbooks is inkinded. HUD considers making the USA 16 a pilot national project. Four of the modules for a North American HDTS are created. A Joint Development/Operations task force completes the second year evaluation for GSD post funding from AID.

Internal: Nexus keeps secret of surprise trip to celebrate Nan Grow's 50th birthday, and is surprised by a second 50th birthday—Phyllis Allard's—in one week.

Contradiction: Broadening discipline to solitary resources. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Health Outpost representatives meet with Cook County Board of Health and Hospitals Governing Commission to begin arrangements on a cooperative venture to reopen health outpost. Commercial school is ready to open next week with 15 registrations. Economic team visits Ivy City to work on urban showcase proposals.

Internal: The Chicago House welcomes the Mueller family and holds a birthday party for two members of the House.

Contradiction: Hiding behind a mountain of tasks in order to avoid tackling the intimidating ones. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Twenty-five people attend Christmas planning meeting and decide on four Friday evenings for major activities beginning with a festival December 1st. Development gets off to a good start with \$1350 in hand from two corporations and several key referrals.

Internal: Two celebrations in one week: ecclesiola and a Mexican dinner Saturday night provide refreshing discontinuity as mission intensifies.

Contradiction: Turning excitement with the quarter's maneuvers into regular engagement through Christmas. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Everyone gets off to Guardian Consult in Chicago. New Thursday night planning format introduces weekly maneuvering for the entire metro to enable the region.

Internal: House Church, shifted to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, the first of the quarter's experiments, seems to hold the transition to Week I in a new way.

Contradiction: Keeping the foundations (materials and logistics) firmly in place as a launching for strongholding. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Two Global Women's Forums are set up in the primal community around the House (Whittier) as a concluding program for a women's career development project in the community.

Internal: Regional and Kinney Houses make connection with Green Giant for free canned vegetables all year.

Contradiction: Linking metro momentum gained through House events to the external mission. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Thirty mayors are contacted and ten clusters are named and phased for year of saturation.

Internal: House grounds regionalis in study collegium, new office decor, and common collegium rationale for colleagues in Mill Shoals and Columbia.

Contradiction: Creating necessary local materials to rehearse story of saturation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Elders luncheon with 35 present is a moving experience as elders recite poems from their past. Project receives concrete pledge of assistance in helping to open print shop.

Internal: The first week of the new quarter is highlighted by visit of Lyman and Enrights and celebration of Addie Lyman's birthday with fabulous ship dinner.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum as completion of major projects nears. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Two days of inking in Minneapolis reaps harvest of linoleum for House; tile for youth canteen, shower stall; toilet; dryer; and a truckload of food. Regional work weekend rips old tin siding and concrete from auxiliary house and begins re-siding. All work stops on Saturday night for Kinney's first *Evening with the Institute*, hosting 30, including a county commissioner and a state representative.

Internal: Week II readings from *Trinity* enable reflection and conversation on the life of a revolutionary.

Contradiction: Prioritizing and timelining all outdoor work before winter hits. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Ten Guardians from two metros attend Guardians Consult. Development makes 16 corporation calls and creates a metro task force for continuing corporation Development. Three more House members are employed. TM brochure is created and produced by metro colleagues. First TM calling in stronghold is begun.

Internal: After driving across the border with two trailers full of necessities, two men from local church in Milwaukee return from Lorne and share slides of the HDP.

Contradiction: Unblocking conflicting time priorities of self-support success and campaign successes. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Global Women's Forum includes many advocates, and training session the following morning from 5 a.m. to 8 a.m. at the House goes well. Four Immortals spend a successful week working with House and metro colleagues in Lafayette and Indianapolis, and leave with \$4,000 in hand, \$1900 in the mail, and another \$10,000 committed in pledges and gifts, including two medical challenge grants by local congregations. Neighborhood Association visits 5th City and new images abound.

Internal: Celebrating the victory with Global Women's Forum and Development teams includes enabling a GWF participant to raise money for Pisinemo Consult, and an Indian feast, compliments of Cyprian.

Contradiction: Creating a structure and rhythm that allows us to respond to seemingly endless possibility in the three campaigns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Champion Paper agrees to print 10,000 brochures for saturation series. Results from last spring's Town Meetings keep coming in the mail.

Internal: Two permeation checks this week mark new level of predictability in self support.

Contradiction: Bringing first big week of saturation off in grand style with troop and transportation glitches. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Five demonstration Town Meetings launch saturation strongholds in the Upper Peninsula and on Detroit's Northeast side, involving 80 people from 13 villages and 14 neighborhoods.

Internal: Lunch with Cleveland House in Toledo gives opportunity to discuss stronghold strategy and training edge.

Contradiction: Securing Town Meeting dates from all communities at the Town Meeting demonstrations. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Town Meeting methods are used by 185 Salvation Army staff to do annual planning for New York City.

Internal: Development collegium on *Million Dollar Miracle* opens realistic possibility of being in the black by January 1, 1979.

Contradiction: Reshaping the quarter's victory in light of year's victory of quality TM events. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Mayor of North Apollo calls with TM date and facility, and offers to do other follow-up.

Internal: Guardian excites House with collegium on Guardian Consult's insights on Development, trust fund, and ECF.

Contradiction: Determining the fine line between the impossible impossible and the possible impossible. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Region gathers in Binghamton to modify timelines and build funding plans for Seneca Lake Maneuvers.

Internal: Experiment with Day II timeline including later meals and ecclesiola at 8 p.m. allows more effective use of evening.

Contradiction: Creating new images of TM set-up while discovering the traps of old images. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with the intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes. Ten Development appointments take place with five more scheduled for next week. The Galbreaths attend the Guardians Consult in Chicago.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: A significant turn in economic activity in the Project is signaled by team presence working on EDA/HUD

applications for 5th City and Ivy City, a \$9,000 week in the printshop, \$500 in hand from Town Meeting campaign, and four researchers on stipend beginning research on Ivy City's changing face.

Internal: Collegiums look at the shadow principle and learnings in the urban.

Contradiction: Recovering a rhythm for significant engagement to cover the total scope of our activities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Widen's float is a shining example of local creativity in county-wide parade. Kids from all stakes join in the fun.

Internal: Bob Howard starts to work and Pat Howard and Elaine Stover set out for preschool training in Pace HDP.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with necessary maneuvers while taking time to elicit decisions to participate from both the community and the region. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Collegium on rereading *The Meaning of the Meeting* provides a screen through which every collegium during the week is pulled, giving a larger context for saturation work in Philadelphia region's four theaters.

Internal: Local troops are raised up in the four theaters and the Harrisburg tri-micro, as saturation events shape up for Weeks 5 and 6.

Contradiction: Moving from working out of a week-by-week context to looking at the whole campaign without vertigo. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Block Association event provides track record and possible entre into the other 10,000 block associations in New York City.

Internal: Breakthrough in self-support is the raising of \$600 with hostelry guests.

Contradiction: Reshaping quarter's victory in light of the year's victory of events set up and Development plan. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: ICA serves as consultant for Regional Small Farms Conference for the northeastern United States held in Poland Springs, Maine. Stronghold saturation hits the road with key authorization and funding calls. Starks Woodshop set-up proceeds rapidly with the miracle of a first order offered by company for pallets.

Internal: Auxiliary moves to new location, farmhouse on Chicken Street, with heat!

Contradiction: Beginning a new phase of Project actuation with unclarity about relationship between facilitating structures. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Dates and facilities begin to shape up in Bridgeport. New Development brochure, designed by the House, is sent out through the efforts of three metro colleagues. Two others spend time on the phone.

Internal: House and Development team attend movie *The Big Fix* about the protest movement in the 60's and where they are now.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with accelerating demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Visits to set up economic PSU, both inside and outside the community, give different perspective on community and reveal a readiness to move.

Internal: Electrical system and gray water drainage system, create signs of permanence.

Contradiction: Soliciting a new depth of engagement in the community. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Call on oldest company and largest employer in stronghold turns up strong authorization for tri-micro forums and probable financial support. Large representatives returning from Guardians Consult attend meeting of lumber workers sponsored by Canadian Consulate.

Internal: New Guardian gives collegium on Guardian Consult and raises possibility of New England Guardians meeting.

Contradiction: Engaging and training new people in pulling off quality forums. (Wk. 5)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: First school committee forum is held with 91 participants. Sixteen parents volunteer to be on the committee. New Day Canada is attended by Those Who Care from area. Economic Community Forum, Global Women's Forum, Community Youth Forum and cabaret release saturation possibilities. Two groups are secured as sponsors with tasks for Global Women's Forum in Montreal.

Internal: House shifts 22 people from Montreal to Campbellton, 500 miles, with hourly changes in transportation models, for New Day Canada saturation event.

Contradiction: Creating the demand for saturation through creating the market, calling the troops, and targeting the locations. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House goes to Area Council in Ottawa, and for the first time, regional maneuvers come out of the area maneuvers. Thanksgiving feast is held, and House participates in global exchange as colleague calls up for address in Europe.

Internal: Vogar invades Toronto in the persons of Doreen Paul and Jean Smith, the marketing team for Webb-a-won quilts.

Contradiction: Creating a step by step saturation plan in order to focus action. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Saturation site is located in North Leeds with 17 villages and seven townships, in conjunction with St. Lawrence College. The Miraculous Million begins to accelerate with Development Centrum present.

Internal: Inkind systems are in place and 10 plates of glass are inkinded.

Contradiction: Stabilizing internal and external support systems to unblock mission expansion. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: One hundred-fifty people come to New Day Canada Assembly and report that the visit to Lorne is a highlight. CYF, GWF and ECF are held simultaneously on Saturday, with a fantastic cabaret that night. Regional battleplanning on Sunday seals the weekend. Valuable networks now are on board, setting the stage for saturation.

Internal: Trinity UMC of Brookfield, Wisconsin, donates a stove, washer, stereo, TV, bedding, furniture, dishes and clothes.

Contradiction: Building practical context and spiritized structures which immediately engage reconfiguring troops. (Wk. 3)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the Miraculous Million Campaign is on schedule with \$104,000 deposited. Ballarpur Industries finalizes village adoption. Development expands new funding arenas as Brussels receives religious order contributions and Levi Strauss executive attends Pisinemo Consult. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining geographic coverage and giving emphasis to where the money lies.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that launching of the HDTS in the Philippines opens up a new era of social demonstration. The Student House at Chicago participates in the global mission by giving \$1,000 to the *Miraculous Million* of Quarter II. The global collegium is launched with inclusion of the first collegium on the retreat in the House packet. Letters and models received in Chicago Nexus from around the globe turn into a global interchange network through the mailing of a Global Band letter. The key contradiction lies in articulating the spirit frame for this movement in the journey that will push the deeps in the work on the modules, retreat, ecclesiola and collegiums.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Brussels participates with Houses in articulating new images, which turns on the three campaigns across Europe. Singapore and Chicago Nexus send personnel to orchestrate Salani Consult in Samoa. Fifteen new Consults are completed in Maharashtra, bringing total number of Projects to 64. Completion of the reports on the global band of Human Development Projects for U.S. AID releases new possibility of increased funding globally. The key contradiction is in the arena of objectifying the victories in the field of the campaign as they gain renewed momentum.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports the printing of 50,000 workbooks inkinded, and the National Report brochure rolls off the press. Global Management Centrum: Bombay reports recent funds from Belgium have been put in fixed deposits and savings to give Nava Gram Prayas a base for the year, while Area Singapore hammers out a new budget. In Chicago, intensive phoning breaks open new possibilities for inkind printing and sets up three-city trek. Area Singapore experiences breakthrough in budget writing by spending necessary time on getting a realistic picture of needs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of working out comprehensive systems and procedures while simultaneously immersed in doing the particulars.

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: The vows, ceremony and wedding celebration of Marilyn Swims and Jose Quintana impact community with their decision to be a bi-cultural, global family residing in Cano Negro. Workday in Caracas transforms office space for effective use in Development and GCF campaigns.

Internal: Arrival of Mercy and Kaki Njeguru, Ann Howie and Toni Mueller gives boost to auxiliary size and spirit.

Contradiction: Planning Quarter II before Quarter II arrives. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Project bakes first bread in new oven with all bread sold each day this week. Cages are built for rabbit industry. New volleyball equipment used under lights greatly increases participation in evening recreation center.

Internal: Auxiliary takes advantage of Columbus Day holiday to create a quarter's plan for the acceleration phase of the Project.

Contradiction: Beckoning others to take leadership roles as number of activities greatly expands. (Wk. 5)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Inkling service of Rio law firm produces winning model on tax-exempt status. Global slide show is key event of first ICA: Brasil board meeting. IADB proposal is submitted for community unity programs. Irrigation system allows garden to flourish during dry season. Literacy classes begin with 18 in attendance. Musical instruments and sports equipment are secured to begin after-school classes. Sewing class meets twice a week in a community home. Four home garden plots are begun. Plaza clean-up is a daily occurrence in the area where new benches have been placed. Pumpkin is planted on the

demonstration farm. Community meetings swell in attendance, as streets are corporately named for local founders.

Internal: After a week of house painting and bamboo bunk bed building, entire skills of the Bananeiras auxiliary are utilized—carpentry, decorating, gardening—in grand move to new house, barraca and cottage in the center of the village.

Contradiction: Creating miracles when daily doing is on target. (Wk. 4)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Do-ment takes on new intensity as Health Outpost treats 60 patients in first week. Stake IV builds a mini-park. New preschool building is lined out. Jamaica Development Bank representatives come for site visit. "Trinamic Trio" joins Jean Forbes in Kingston to break open ground for two GWFs in October. Visits to businesswomen, diplomat's wives, church and social leadership produce yeses.

Internal: House celebrates Lingafelter's tenth wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Living the broader vision that lends meaning and urgency to week-by-week maneuvering. (Wk. 13)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Translation of Conacaste HDP Consult document is completed and sent to the typist. Drinking water is available to entire village after pump repairs are made. White rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank transform the village plaza.

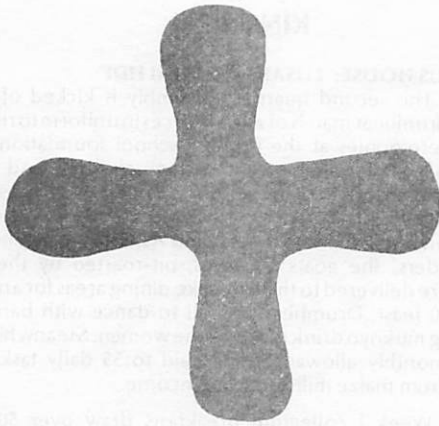
Internal: Auxiliary is organized in teams for the actuation of the Project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: First Tai'rgwaith/Isle of Dogs Project interchange is actuated with weekend in Tai'rgwaith. Highlights include the practical experience of being part of a network of demonstration projects by local people and decision of Kath Sim to "wear the blue" and self-consciously care for women in Tai'rgwaith. Two GWFs and two CYFs are firm for London Metro weeks 8-9. Fraing continues with visits to YWCA and National Council of Women who give strong affirmation of work.

Internal: House attends *The Girlfriends* as part of ecclesiola and meet John Dunne with great anticipation of the study.

Contradiction: Building the whole bridge with only one fourth of the planks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Grampian and Highland Maneuver is completed with victory of community education networks open for November Town Meetings. Invitations go out to pave the way for Panchayat visit.

Internal: Ecclesiola celebration takes the form of a visit to colleague's home by the one left in House.

Contradiction: Using style which frees the gift of risking but at a more rapid pace for mass awakening. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: *Vision* is produced by local publications task force. Five people spearhead membership drive for Friendly Society and over 100 families join. Management Committee is elected next evening, thus establishing Project legal body. Village women meet and plan community-large celebration and GWF, and ICA staff are invited to meeting.

Internal: House women go to GWF pedagogy while men put out the newspapers and watch local rugby match, demonstrating the power of the surpris maneuver.

Contradiction: Training leadership already in position to move on the complexities of Human Development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Various events launch Manchester and New Castle strongholds as circuter and House members attend minister colleague induction, Young Christian Workers meeting, show Social Demonstration slides to New Castle Robin Hood Gang youth, and hold two potential steering committee meetings.

Internal: Permeator lands first temporary job while continuing permanent job interviews and traveling to Longon for GWF pedagogy—all in same day.

Contradiction: Creating a "rider" for strongholds that embodies the urgency of the mission. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Week of Development opens contacts with religious orders in Paris. Slide show with 20 Oblate and Benedictine Sisters is highlighted with opening address given by Bishop Mathews.

Internal: The House is honored by an Indian curry dinner prepared by Bishop and Mrs. Mathews and gift of a bottle of wine from Cana, Israel.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum going on two fronts at once. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Three Community Forums are held in three new provinces that demonstrate the helpfulness of new workbook, the possibility of good attendance and the possibility of doing quality meetings. House hosts 55 from the Rome English-speaking Methodist Church in Termine. They deeply address the villagers and offer valuable technical and financial assistance to the Termine Industries.

Internal: Saturday night celebration is held with the whole House present for the first time in two weeks, including two Italian sojourners.

Contradiction: Keeping a step ahead of going 150 kilometers an hour. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Visit to CFAO opens contract for pillows at 40,000 pillows per month. Material arrives to start production on Friday. Also two 25 hp Yamaha boat engines arrive and are tested on a run to Palaver Island. Ijede Public School teachers sign up for Imaginal Education. Sewing nets for the fish firms next phase is completed and ready for set up in the lagoon. All five guilds meet together to plan for key events leading to Guardian meeting in Ijede. Federal Ministry of Works begins work on Orere Road which is the second of seven which will cover all of Ijede with better roads. Federal Ministry of Works furnishes men and equipment, and Ijede furnishes food for both.

Internal: House celebrates by taking a "flying" boat trip to Seamen's Mission for a swimming party, a real testing of new boat motors and the crew members as well.

Contradiction: Establishing regular employment in Ijede. (Wk. 6)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: For the first time all quarter, all three Development circuits are on the road.

Internal: New Reality spin grounds with full images the primacy of Earth's care.

Contradiction: Objectifying the picture of working monies over against bottom lines. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House puts demonstration operational filing system for Europe into use even before it is written.

Internal: New Reality spin on Earth's care and the grounding of John Dunne's journey shapes the week.

Contradiction: Creating advantages out of the situation. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Dorpsdag in Bentelo with over 200 participants is led by eight local workshop leaders. Amsterdam—Noord group sets date for training of leaders for November 19 meeting. New brochure is ready to print with eight Guardians listed as advisors, and 15 Guardians set to meet during Panchayat visit.

Internal: House celebrates Dorpsdag victory with inkind paper goods, inkind bread, and 20 inkind McDonald's hamburgers.

Contradiction: Broadcasting across the Netherlands the story of the great happening of Bentelo Dorpsdag. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: In one single Development call, a church pastor decides to set up a Town Meeting, an adopt-a-village program for his church, and a slide show presentation on Human Development Projects—all to happen on one day.

Internal: Panchayat visitation team arrives just in time to witness the excitement of representatives from three communities at the House for a community development seminar.

Contradiction: Re-directing passion for one's home turf to others' home turfs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Sixteenth edition of *Laterne*, community newspaper, is printed, folded, stuffed and delivered. Community assumes

responsibility for running cafe during Sylvia's recuperation from an injury. English classes decide to extend their classes two more weeks for community language school. Beautiful community calendar of events on bulletin board excites community. Panchayat has great visit with Bishop Sharf.

Internal: Fifty community people and Guardians attend reception evening for Panchayat—a resounding evening with plenty of powerful songs.

Contradiction: Finding the most effective structures for long-range, steady responsibility. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: The second quarterly assembly is kicked off with colorful drumbeat march of all task forces in uniform to ribbon-cutting ceremonies at the primary school foundation, new maize mill, staff training center, general store, and huge, circular grass-roofed Guild Hall. Six guilds plan and present 30 victories for Quarter II. Following pre-school teachers' graduation, the Iron Man award, and Assembly consensus on guild leaders, the goats and pigs, pit-roasted by the farm trainees are delivered to the five stake dining areas for a plenty-for-all 300 feast. Drumbeats call all to dance with barrels of refreshing mukoyo drink made by the women. Meanwhile, the second monthly allowances are paid to 55 daily task force workers from maize mill and store income.

Internal: Week I collegium breakfasts draw over 50 each morning as maneuver methods are worked through in preparation for weekend planning.

Contradiction: Finding ways to undergird new community-wide engagement in the stake-a-day building of the primary school. (Wk. 4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Guild meeting of 60 plus caps week of painting water tank and introduction of hydroponic garden in community kitchen. 120 USD marmalade sold and village Project director assuming mantle with decision to be at the collegium table every morning.

Internal: House decor blitz renews space.

Contradiction: Maintaining necessary authorization for village acceleration. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Comartka weathers another storm as "walkout" gives rise to new core and permission to form the industry. Tree planting by Jubilee Insurance Company and community people opens door for many trees for the beautification of the community. New collegiality and decision to risk bursts forth in a long planning session followed by a fantastic celebration with staff and community leadership. Farm comes alive with new management model and "husbands" for the female goats. A Guardian, Mr. Rajani, when asked for paper, continues to raise the question of what else.

Internal: On the way to get the mail, Rose hears a woman's cry for help and stops to deliver her baby.

Contradiction: Getting as ready as the troops are. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Kamweleni is energized by community meeting led by community leader Mzee Ndolo and a moving speech by blind elder Mzee Kalai. A massive step is made in framing as a high-powered community delegation visits five top level government officials in one day, and District Commissioner

assures full support. KHDP is invited to serve on two district-wide planning committees to determine spending of 200 million shillings. District Commissioner gives nod to Village Meetings in every village in the Machakos Integrated Development Project—200 villages. Kamweleni HDP is selected as a demonstration health program for the Machakos Integrated Development Project area, and a commitment is made for a resident Clinical Officer, paramedic with advanced training, to staff community dispensary. Government commits staff and medications for an immediate interim weekly clinic in the Health Outpost and a community-wide malaria suppression campaign.

Internal: House sings for six hours all the Other World, Love and Pop/Folk songs, in a marathon troop revival.

Contradiction: Enabling every auxiliary to stand on death ground. (Wk. 4)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Preparations are made for Continental Council. The completion of 20 Consults is celebrated. The opening of the ninth HDTS and the arrival of 29 *ambar charkha* (yarn) spinning machines for Chikhale are portents of victory.

Internal: The Order celebrates the marriage of Madan Tribuwan and Ruby Salve in Bombay.

Contradiction: Positioning the circuits for HDTS recruitment and new campaign while consolidating long-range planning. (Wk. 5)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Sikroar, 45 minutes drive from Delhi, is chosen as Delhi Project site. Misra of International Tobacco asks for materials to do state authorization. Architect works on community center auxiliary House design. First local participant for this HDTS is sent out and regional colleague accompanies House troops to council at Sevagram.

Internal: Tribal resettlement culminates in a House celebration.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly from planning to doing. (Wk. 6)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Personal invitations are delivered to metro colleagues during visitation campaign to attend two upcoming metro events. First edition of area UPDATE is mailed.

Internal: House opens bank account, symbolizing to establishment that ICA office in Calcutta is serious about intent to work in this area.

Contradiction: Shifting established operating images on other side of this week's Continental Council. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Old colleagues are tapped for assistance in Nexus self-support maneuvers.

Internal: House sends out Phyllis Mielke to Bubun and Bontoa Consults, and welcomes visitors, Wegners and Jill Eglad.

Contradiction: Bringing corporate stew to decision and moving on it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Ticketing colleagues to enable third Consult in zone stretches American Express to the limit. Development discovers the golden city of Kuala Lumpur.

Internal: House hosts colleagues passing through with in-House celebration of beer and "Hearts."

Contradiction: Keeping all the plates spinning in spite of gusts of wind. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: All three tractors are in working condition, busy plowing, planting, and spreading fertilizer on demonstration plots. The *pasar* (village market) opens on Wednesday and is sold out of all fish and vegetables every day. House moves 30 metal drums, tractors, and two unrepairable jeeps out of ICA front yard and down to agricultural complex. Singapore Development strengthens co-op power and goes on 16 appointments, tying together British company contacts, systematizing data on contacts, following up on past contacts and generally "flogging up a froth." Followup on a January appointment in Penang prompts Kampulan Barkat representative site visit on Friday and promise of M\$1,000. Saturday Lam Soon site visit prompts M\$1,350 check on Monday morning. Two people, in one day, write a four page \$31,000 proposal for the Canadian High Commissioner who indicates money forthcoming after site visit in two weeks.

Internal: House sends out Rob Jennings-Teats and Joani Fleshman to Serusup after completing Serusup document publication in both English and Malay with all parts inked and help of secretary typing 80 pages of Malay over the weekend.

Contradiction: Getting the news out to total community that the flurry of activity they see is a signal of Sungai Lui getting ready to show itself to the world. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: University students and TVRI show film of Stake One to the villagers and spend two days filming for the TV documentary. Four more village children join preschool. One

hundred fifty villagers come to guild meeting to listen to the three villagers who went to Bontoa give report. Three families plant home garden. USAID comes to visit and is very excited with the Project. PMI (Town Meeting) trek returns after great trek.

Internal: Staff and villagers spend day painting Emerging Generation room bright colors.

Contradiction: Enabling the villagers to take comprehensive responsibility for the community. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Over 40 families build chicken house to give form to Consult decision to enclose the ayam, which have made their presence felt everywhere. Each family has agreed to put in two chickens and Rp 1000 (\$5) for feed costs and will share profits equally.

Internal: Participation of all auxiliary staff in English class three times weekly enables the symblic life of the House.

Contradiction: Building into every program the means for its continuation by village people. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: A newly constructed, freshly painted white bamboo fence completely surrounding the village plaza is a sign of the newness emerging everywhere. The Bontoa preschool teachers become vibrantly alive as they participate in their first lesson-building session. Good coverage of the Consult by local and national newspapers achieves goal of a demonstration for all of Indonesia.

Internal: The Bontoa Consult ends with great village initiative emerging, celebrated at the home of Sjamsul Bachir, head of the Department of Social Affairs.

Contradiction: Utilizing and redirecting the village anxiety about how to accomplish all the tactics planned before the rains come. (Wk.6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Exciting reports are given by Ken Hamje on Bontoa Consult and Don Clark on Area Tokyo. Nexus sends out Development treks to Philippines (Davao and Manila) and Japan, Ken Hamje to Hai Ou HDP, and Don Clark on his way to be the Wedge in Area Sydney.

Internal: Celebrative ecclesiola is joined by the Hong Kong House with wine and cheese and attendance at Javanese dance performance.

Contradiction: Enabling Movement to continually stand present to the social contradictions in the five nations. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The second round of negotiations between the Nam Wai Foundation Ltd. and land development companies takes place as the final day for completing sale of all individually owned land to the Foundation approaches. At the end of a Development trek, \$1,000 USD is received, two checks are in the mail and one large donation is promised. Unrelenting visibility campaign has villagers planting flowers and removing weeds, with volunteers arising from stake meetings.

Internal: A study of *Our Corporation Vocation* catalyzes creative reflection on both individuals' journeys and the profound function of an order in history.

Contradiction: Maintaining a long-range vision without being swallowed up by the short-range advantages. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: The creation of a community tour elicits new story

about the miracle of Hai Ou's development, the first harvest of prawn on a new one-hectare pond chosen as a demonstration sold for 12,000 USD.

Internal: Hamje family arrives and together with Armas family and rest of the staff are treated by the village to a large seafood feast.

Contradiction: Creating the victory story that catalyzes community engagement. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Philippine portion of 1978-79 area Development budget (110,000 USD) is committed in two week Development blitz. AID check is in hand. Internal: House hosts HDTs global staff enroute to Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Communicating data about issues and priorities across the area, economically and timely. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: ICA Taiwan 1977-78 Report is completed as is the first draft of Town Meeting workbook. Cabinet minister calls ICA office to request additional copies of Hai Ou villagers' Sudtonggan Report recently sent to him.

Internal: Preschool teacher from Hai Ou visits Taipei House Church with friend from Cebu who assisted in translation for Hai Ou villagers in Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in all set-up tactics for Town Meeting while maneuvering for appropriate official acknowledgements and public rider. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Three vilages are selected with formal invitations to the ICA and ten villagers are selected for HDTs with fourth village in the works. Projects sends two craft managers and Linda Alton to Manila to market crafts. Inkind and Development swamp Cebu in preparation for the Training School.

Internal: Collegium on "red carpet" hosting for Project guests prepares the village for anticipated arrival of Development contacts, HDTs participants and visitors.

Contradiction: Taking comprehensive responsibility for the Project, Development and the Training School, simultaneously. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New quarter begins with large community assembly which establishes consensus to have weekly community meetings. Demonstration Japanese earthbank kiln for brick industry is completed. Marketing and research team to expand sewing industry hits the road. Frame for community nursery is completed and seeds obtained. Yearly Langub fiesta is celebrated with cultural show from the University of Mindanao. Construction fo the Training Center/staff house begins anew. A second day care center with 31 children opens in Mojon stake. City Health doctors begin regular visits with 61 patients on the first day.

Internal: House welcomes Ben and Leoncita Potot and seven children, Rudy and Miguela Tero and two children, Godofredo and Dalinay Estorgio and six children, and Susan Amistoso from Sudtonggan as new staff for the year.

Contradiction: Getting a regular supply system into existence. (Wk.5)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Three more Town Meetings are set in three more prefectures. Sushila of India and Osaka prepares India curry for a party which is visited suddenly by "Dada," an Indian priest in bright orange turban and garb, who is struck by ICA slide show of Projects around the world. The slides also influence a new Japanese colleague to take a round-the-world tour to visit ICA Houses and Projects.

Internal: Jim Oberg and Kathy Bauknight arrive to begin their successful Development weeks in Tokyo.

Contradiction: Hosting the Panchayat when so many House members are out trekking. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Health Outpost moves forward serving 15 patients. Stake Meeting is well attended, and common price for grain threshing is set. The most exciting harvesting for the tangerines begins.

Internal: House celebrates Miss Huh's invitation letter by attending movie and feasting on the first eggs laid by auxiliary's ducks.

Contradiction: Finding the catalytic role among the village leaders in order to target the priorities for Kwang Yung Il HDP. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Project funding leaps with promises of \$1000 grant from agricultural union and \$4000 long-term loan from government.

Internal: Costly repair of House boiler is inked, a ray of sunshine amidst chilly fog that settles on the valley until noon each day.

Contradiction: Assuring a futuristic timeline amidst competition from those maintained by the county, the village and the weather. (Wk. 6)

External: Visit to national office of Lions International opens possibility of CMA support. Week II PSUs set up designs for quarter's Guardian involvement and new meshing of external and internal mission.

Internal: House hosts Bill Newkirk en route to Jakarta forestry conference, and colleagues from Melbourne, Murrin Bridge, Canberra and Brisbane.

Contradiction: Rebuilding momentum and establishing other beachheads. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Two-day saturation stronghold field visits initiate the two year, tri-polis campaign in the region.

Internal: Heart to heart talk with local Guardian opens the way for house hunting and car dealing in line with saturation strategies.

Contradiction: Getting to the people by picking up the phone and talking. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: The first RS-1 in Australia in two years yields 21 around the table and is unanimously hailed as a highly relevant formation event that still raises the right questions. A meeting is held with the Marialta Trust about a CYF proposal.

Internal: Regional colleagues hold workday to transform collegium room and garden.

Contradiction: Getting on the road with all maneuvers. (Wk. 4)

External: House visits with village chiefs and is honored with ceremonial Kava and invitation to move into the village.

Internal: House rehearses that symbol is key through team assignments and models, capped off with "Music Theater" Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating the structures to release the local village and colleagues to pick up the practical tasks of do-ment in Salani HDP. (Wk. 6)

Contradiction: Singing in the rain while soaked, lacking strong-holding umbrellas! (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Two hundred people attend health exposition and two people work to create park at migrant camp. Four community people assist in county saturation. Ninety youth attend a dance planned by community youth. Critically needed housing and storage arrives in the form of portable buildings.

Internal: All is celebrated on Saturday at House along with Paula Louioski's birthday.

Contradiction: Remembering wisdom of corporate methods and spirit nurture in the rush to "do" the Project. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Cusick initiates community movies. Fourteen people show up to volunteer for Fire Department. Stakes I and V work on their neighborhood by raking leaves, putting up storm windows and fixing one leaky roof. Community celebrates the work with a weiner roast.

Contradiction: Breaking open authorization, Development and local Guardians while continuing Project at full steam. (Wk. 6)

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Appointments are set with Montana Power and Mountain Bell, past Town Meeting supporters, to catalyze statewide support for Montana Town Meetings.

Internal: House launches new self-support strategy and prepares two apartments for rental this November.

Contradiction: Catalyzing people into revealing their passion, so that their care might be released and effectively channeled into missional priorities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Industry spends week making production process more effective with acquisition of punch/sheer and the expertise of Ray Oliver, a toolmaker from Oregon. Truck farm crew brings in the last 3700 pounds of potatoes to complete the truck farm harvest for the year.

Internal: Arrival of new Canadian Human Development Projects brochure symbolizes new phase in national consciousness of Those Who Care.

Contradiction: Using small forces effectively. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: First stake meeting is held with Global Slide Show. Colleagues attend Guardian Consult, two for the first time.

Internal: Interior doors are painted and fire exit installed, as first touch of snow arrives.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering quickly and effectively in midst of troop shifts and priority changes. (Wk. 5)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

Internal: House welcomes Asherton staff and citizens, Development trek, authorization trek, area prior, Oklahoma City prior and extended family for week's swirl of events.

Contradiction: Holding the tension of quality saturation events using short set-up model with only two staff in the field. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Diplomats visit from U.S. State Department, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka, and indicate Pace is the most exciting visit of their trek in the U.S. Community leadership decisions are symbolized over dinner and investiture, including presentation of journals and guild pins. Survey is launched by community. Public hearing on city budget affirms consensus of support for mayor's public improvements strategy.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences long-awaited reality of backstage role.

Contradiction: Undergirding vocational decisions of key leadership and enabling long-range planning and motivity methods. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Assembly is held, signaling the first maneuver completion.

Internal: Saturday work day with many regional colleagues help complete two thirds of House painting and ends with a Guardian celebration at dinner.

Contradiction: Enabling all troops to take total responsibility for the complete mission, while doing a fine job of particular assignments (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

Internal: The three stakes celebrate Halloween with all ages in costume, trick-or-treating and playing games.

Contradiction: Moving on assignments before shortages become intolerable. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Health Outpost representatives meet with Cook County Board of Health and Hospitals Governing Commission to begin arrangements on a cooperative venture to reopen health outpost. Commercial school is ready to open next week with 15 registrations. Economic team visits Ivy City to work on urban showcase proposals.

Internal: The Chicago House welcomes the Mueller family and holds a birthday party for two members of the House.

Contradiction: Hiding behind a mountain of tasks in order to avoid tackling the intimidating one (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Twenty-five people attend Christmas planning meeting and decide on four Friday evenings for major activities beginning with a festival December 1st. Development gets off to a good start with \$1350 in hand from two corporations and several key referrals.

Internal: Two celebrations in one week: ecclesiola and a Mexican dinner Saturday night provide refreshing discontinuity as mission intensifies.

Contradiction: Turning excitement with the quarter's maneuvers into regular engagement through Christmas. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Everyone gets off to Guardian Consult in Chicago. New Thursday night planning format introduces weekly maneuvering for the entire metro to enable the region.

Internal: House Church, shifted to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, the first of the quarter's experiments, seems to hold the transition to Week I in a new way.

External: Entire tri-metro is assigned to five micro teams to set up stronghold events. Allen Bradley Corporation calls to ask where to send the check.

Internal: Ecclesiola combines encounter with John Dunne with metro meeting for a sodality using war room decor charts.

Contradiction: Doing stronghold strategy through an effective plan which shows the need for "a calling to colleagues." (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: David Speicher inkind 48-foot, fully furnished mobile home and shipping costs from family business for Richgrove HDP, to provide additional auxiliary housing. ICA booth featuring Human Development Projects at Indianapolis International Festival is visited by thousands, and 140 passersby sign up for further contact with ICA. Lafayette and Indianapolis cadres hold simultaneous *Papillion* parties with dinner, movie on TV and conversation.

Internal: Kitty Cole provides interchange on saturation, representing Operations Centrum.

Contradiction: Working out the Assembly model and smooth support systems for "Top of the State" stronghold. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Champion Paper agrees to print 10,000 brochure for saturation series. Results from last spring's Town Meetings keep coming in the mail.

Internal: Two permeation checks this week mark new level of predictability in self support.

Contradiction: Bringing first big week of saturation off in grand style with troop and transportation glitches. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Development breakthrough happens when four teams hit the pavement for two days visiting local businesses in the saturation neighborhood, major Detroit corporations and new colleagues from previous stronghold, returning with money in hand and two church presentations scheduled. First of three GWFs are held for displaced homemakers through Departments of Labor and Vocational Education.

Internal: House celebrates Development breakthroughs with team and Guardians at all-you-can-eat crab leg feast.

Contradiction: Sustaining consistent Development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Third event in New York City tri-metro saturation takes place with The Caring Community (group of elders) with over 100 people and three key networks in attendance.

Internal: Fine ecclesiola on Thursday night highlights a week in which troops are dispersed in doing seven events.

Contradiction: Re-empowering the regional dynamic in relation to Development, logistics and personnel. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Mayor of North Apollo calls with TM date and facility, and offers to do other follow-up.

Internal: Guardian excites House with collegium on Guardian Consult's insights on Development, trust fund, and ECF.

Contradiction: Determining the fine line between the impossible impossible and the possible impossible. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Region gathers in Binghamton to modify timelines and build funding plans for Seneca Lake Maneuvers.

Internal: Experiment with Day II timeline including later meals and ecclesiola at 8 p.m. allows more effective use of evening.

Contradiction: Creating new images of TM set-up while discovering the traps of old images. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes. Ten Development appointments take place with five more scheduled for next week. The Galbreaths attend the Guardian Consult in Chicago.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: A significant turn in economic activity in the Project is signaled by team presence working on EDA/HUD applications for 5th City and Ivy City, a \$9,000 week in the printshop, \$500 in hand from Town Meeting campaign, and four researchers on stipend beginning research on Ivy City's changing face.

Internal: Collegiums look at the shadow principle and learnings in the urban.

Contradiction: Recovering a rhythm for significant engagement to cover the total scope of our activities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Widenites participate in all phases of a great Halloween carnival by making booths, selling refreshments, seeing a movie and then having the most fun-filled trick-or-treat night in recent years.

Internal: House hosts Guardians from Cleveland region for Economic P.S.U.

Contradiction: Focusing efforts of Guardians, House and community to make visible wins. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: House reflects on simultaneous permeation/saturation as the spirit edge, and takes a good look at the whole three-year campaign and the necessary demand to train local people. Vincent Scott, from the Philadelphia tri-micro targeted for saturation next quarter, comes back from Academy saying local people are ready to move and are already being trained.

Internal: Atlantic City framing for Quarter III builds gradually with once-a-week appointments guided by House reflection and maneuver writing.

Contradiction: Assuring that all relevant data is included in weekly comprehensive maneuver writing to deal with foreseeable immediacies and safeguard corporate consensus. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: First wave of New York saturation events is completed.

Internal: Decision of leadership is manifest in fine ecclesiola event with a dynamic sodality.

Contradiction: Re-empowering the regional dynamic in relation to logistics, Development and event staffing. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: ICA serves as consultant for Regional Small Farms Conference for the northeastern United States held in Poland Springs, Maine. Stronghold saturation hits the road with key authorization and funding calls. Starks Woodshop set-up proceeds rapidly with the miracle of a first order offered by company for pallets.

Internal: Auxiliary moves to new location, farmhouse on Chicken Street, with heat!

Contradiction: Beginning a new phase of Project actuation with unclarity about relationships between facilitating structures. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Dates and facilities begin to shape up in Bridgeport. New Development brochure, designed by the House, is sent out through the efforts of three metro colleagues. Two others spend time on the phone.

Internal: House and Development team attend movie *The Big Fix* about the protest movement in the 60's and where they are now.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with accelerating demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Visits to set up economic PSU, both inside and outside the community, give different perspective on community and reveal a readiness to move.

Internal: Electrical system and gray water drainage system create signs of permanence.

Contradiction: Soliciting a new depth of engagement in the community. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House hosts committee meeting made up of eight of Those Who Care. Group sets dates and begins work on two forums in the stronghold neighborhood of Whittenton.

Internal: House is impacted by global and areal events during collegiums by Maharashtra monther and area prior.

Contradiction: Shoring up a training event and Assembly in order to transform individual forums into stronghold happening. (Wk. 6)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Two GWFs are scheduled for urban communities of Montreal, enabled by translations of financial forms and proposals into French for Secretary of State grant. Five CFCs are set for Gaspé of Region Quebec and signal School Committee Forum workshops are done in three languages.

Internal: Beautiful new global grid impacts all who enter the House, including the second sojourner of the quarter.

Contradiction: Covering orchestration and funding needs experienced as trying to keep up with the galloping polar bear. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Visits to Guardians and advocates in Guelph and Halton regional municipalities ground the saturation kick-off planning, and become the first step into the stronghold. GWF with women workers in a whole government department suddenly becomes a possibility.

Internal: Colleagues and guests outnumber House again at ecclesiola and House Church as colleagues and local consultants returning from India, the Peoples Republic of China, Cano Negro and Jamaica give reports and show slides.

Contradiction: Effectively engaging Toronto colleagues who want to work with the House on a regular basis, but can't go on extended circuits. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Trip to North Leeds communities and contacts with individuals from last year's forums reveals eagerness to do saturation stronghold. Ottawa school parents' group decides to do a forum, making the beginning of an Ottawa urban stronghold.

Internal: Margaret Piper is reassigned to Siberia as Sheila and Diana Hickey from Lorne are eagerly awaited and House completes first consultation for self-support.

Contradiction: Redirecting antsiness and role ambiguity from timeline alterations to deal with financial tyrant. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Everyone is engaged as four combine Guardian Consult with research/marketing trip covering two nations, nine states, three provinces and three time zones. Six cabinetmakers take two-day trip to provincial furniture

factories. Adult education center opens with two classrooms and a library.

Internal: The phoenix arises with the securing of a new three-bedroom furnished mobile home for nine months in kind and the birth of Dara Elise Stringham, seven and one half pounds, October 10th.

Contradiction: Getting immediate funds for programs which need short-term funding before winter comes, in the midst of long-term funding plan. (Wk. 6)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Village agriculture is intensified by meeting with experts to solve problems of licrosa crop and explore expansion.

Internal: Five year's files in one coordination center are made usable by moving, cleaning, sorting and transferring entire center to seventh floor in corporate blitz.

Contradiction: Hurtling language barrier which causes paralytic interaction between auxiliary and community. (Wk. 6)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Technical assistance of Deakonia, IMPROA, Catholic University and Health Service nutritionist demonstrates how to get aid directly to local people. Analysis reveals 96 adults involved in programs as well as representation in the bakery and force of 20% of the families in the community. Core of local leadership takes assignments in the recreation center and in sector visitation.

Internal: Reordering space in "impossible" office creates new possibility.

Contradiction: Keeping people interested in new economic ventures when process of obtaining materials and training is slow. (Wk. 6)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Special forces arrive to vaccinate villagers against tuberculosis. Bakeries are visited in Silva Jardim and Rio Bonito as lard is donated for community bakery. The lettuce crop is selling well; tomatoes in two weeks. Major Development breakthrough happens as request for philanthropic status in Brasil is pushed through. Major donor agrees to provide services as an umbrella agency to Bananeiras contributions.

Internal: Workday creates village demonstration garden at House, capped off with Irish celebration.

Contradiction: Finding the gimmick that will move the community beyond one-by-one participation to raise up a core of community leadership. (Wk. 6)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Careful framing pays off as letters from Canadian High Commission, Venezuelan Embassy, Anglican Bishop, and Government Minister ensure granting of work permit exemptions for ICA extra-nationals. Shell visit: Project to work out details for \$1,000 in kind agricultural chemicals. Letter confirms Jamaica Development Bank gift of \$1500. Tropiculture, local exporter, gives check for \$60. Four impact events total 125 participants as awakening campaign is launched.

Internal: House plaques are received at House Church in drama of commissioning.

Contradiction: Nailing down the markets for launching local industry. (Wk. 6)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Possibilities swirl as three adults prepare to train as teachers in Conacaste's new wicker products industry. A doctor, the Director General of UNICEF Guatemala, opens hospital doors to any sick child from the village. UNICEF donates much-needed cooking utensils, as well as sewing machines, which inspires local resident to offer a room in her home for sewing classes. A Guatemalan engineering company buys a pump and motor for the first irrigation demonstration in the Project.

Internal: Motorcycle population of the auxiliary doubles, as two new "Motos," one given by UNICEF, arrive with a roar and flourish, thus aiding in traveling the three kilometers of bad road.

Contradiction: Developing funding to back up the new opportunities offered by gifts in diverse arenas. (Wk. 6)

WEEK SIX

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports USAID releases first draw of \$6300 for Langub HDP. Paris circuit uncovers good will and cash from Religious Order. Framing job done in Egypt with Chase Manhattan Bank opens the door to Chase in New York City. The key contradiction lies in the arena of objectifying the picture of working money over against the bottom line for the remainder of the year.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports troops constantly on the road as Research participates in HDTS in Sudtonggan, Development and Consult treks. Reports from Bontoa expand SEAPAC perspective of Hong Kong Nexus. Creation of six-month calendar allows Chicago to grasp victory of Ten Day Leadership Lab, HDP modules, HDTS set-up, retreat, ecclesiola and Journal requirements. Close cooperation and interchange with other centurms allows corporate mind to forge a victory on all fronts. The key contradiction lies in the arena of reconfiguring troops and maneuvers into corporate strikes which capture death ground.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that signal events included a report to the Hong Kong Nexus on authorization at the Bontoa Consult, Singapore staffing third consult in two months, while Chicago debriefs documentation trek to Maharashtra and pulls together monitoring reports on North American saturation. Significant urban saturation maneuvers are happening in Los Angeles, Detroit and New York. The key contradiction lies in the arena of interchange and monitoring systems that enable the centrum to adequately serve and inform the campaigns.

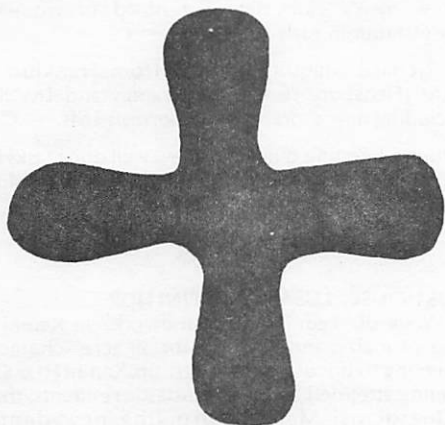
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports financial systems for the Order issue new reports from Hong Kong and Chicago. Singapore reports on the creation of the Nexus budget. Brussels reports framing visits with the Belgium Government to land residency and work permits. The Centrum hits the road with a pilot legal visit to Lorimor and a paper blitz in New York netting paper for 50,000 workbooks. Being the invisible service force creating miracles catalyzes others' care and engagement. The key contradiction lies in the arena of global interchange of fiscal data which clouds decision making on cash flow.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: First Tai'rgwaith/Isle of Dogs Project interchange is actuated with weekend in Tai'rgwaith. Highlights include the practical experience of being part of a network of demonstration projects by local people and decision of Kath Sim to "wear the blue" and self-consciously care for women in Tai'rgwaith. Two GWFs and two CYFs are firm for London Metro Weeks 8-9. Framing continues with visits to YWCA and National Council of Women who give strong affirmation of work.

Internal: House attends *The Girlfriends* as part of ecclesiola and meet John Dunne with great anticipation of the study.

Contradiction: Building the whole bridge with only one fourth of the planks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: London GWF and pedagogy session are attended by Rosemary Fleming and Marge Allan which prepares staff for GWF in Scotland. Ruth Dyhr returns from two-week Grampian/Highland trek to join women in London.

Internal: Transportation becomes tricky as Glasgow buses remain on strike for second week.

Contradiction: Moving all the fronts simultaneously in order for new doors to continually open to the total population. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: *Vision* is produced by local publications task force. Five people spearhead membership drive for Friendly Society and over 100 families join. Management Committee is elected next evening, thus establishing Project legal body. Village women meet and plan community-large celebration and GWF, and ICA staff are invited to meeting.

Internal: House women go to GWF pedagogy while men put out the newspapers and watch local rugby match, demonstrating the power of the surprise maneuver.

Contradiction: Training leadership already in position to move on the complexities of Human Development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Various events launch Manchester and New Castle strongholds as circuter and House members attend minister colleague induction, Young Christian Workers meeting, show Social Demonstration slides to New Castle Robin Hood Gang youth, and hold two potential steering committee meetings.

Internal: Permeator lands first temporary job while continuing permanent job interviews and traveling to London for GWF pedagogy—all in same day.

Contradiction: Creating a "rider" for strongholds that embodies the urgency of the mission. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Week of Development opens contacts with religious orders in Paris. Slide show with 20 Oblate and Benedictine Sisters is highlighted with opening address given by Bishop Mathews.

Internal: The House is honored by an Indian curry dinner prepared by Bishop and Mrs. Mathews and gift of a bottle of wine from Cana, Israel.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum going on two fronts at once. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The *Cooperativa Artiganale* (Industrial Co-op) signs legal document. Ten members celebrate with champagne. Guardian event in Rome with Panchayat promises further help with marketing and authorization. Two staff are invited to guild family wedding feast. Town Meeting is set up and assisted by two Terminese.

Internal: Panchayat visitation with Vance, Epps, Parker, Pesek and Lyn Mathews brings welcome pause and opportunity for global objectivity and news.

Contradiction: Recruiting Italian circuiters to keep up with the openness of Italian villages and networks. (Wk. 7)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Visit to CFAO opens contract for pillows at 40,000 pillows per month. Material arrives to start production on Friday. Also two 25 hp Yamaha boat engines arrive and are tested on a run to Palaver Island. Ijede Public School teachers sign up for Imaginal Education. Sewing nets for the fish firms next phase is completed and ready for set up in the lagoon. All five guilds meet together to plan for key events leading to Guardian meeting in Ijede. Federal Ministry of Works begins work on Orere Road which is the second of seven which will cover all of Ijede with better roads. Federal Ministry of Works furnishes men and equipment, and Ijede furnishes food for both.

Internal: House celebrates by taking a "flying" boat trip to Seamen's Mission for a swimming party, a real testing of new boat motors and the crew members as well.

Contradiction: Establishing regular employment in Ijede. (Wk. 6)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The Guardians' event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakening and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyshock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move to saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Twenty Guardians welcome Panchayat and actively participate in workshop on Dorpsdag, as well as volunteering time and offering hostelry. One more colleague joins circuit force.

Internal: Sr. Yvonne Guenec from France breaks open religious order facility possibilities in the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Operating out of goal contradiction-oriented images of victory. (Wk. 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: In one single Development call, a church pastor decides to set up a Town Meeting, an adopt-a-village program for his church, and a slide show presentation on Human Development Projects—all to happen on one day.

Internal: Panchayat visitation team arrives just in time to witness the excitement of representatives from three communities at the House for a community development seminar.

Contradiction: Re-directing passion for one's home turf to others' home turfs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Wrangelstrasse holds first House TM. Printing press is moved to *treffpunkt* basement to begin new communications center. Fourteen appointments with local Kreuzberg Ost industries are made for community development with four community people going on calls. Final Advent church letters are mailed for Development. Exciting presentation to German-American women's club nets a busload of women for Kreuzberg Ost tour in early November.

Internal: Richard Maquire returns from Frankfurt with exciting TM (Flensburg to Vienna) strategy and TM victory stories, including new short form for German TMs.

Contradiction: Keeping quality of a few well done tasks in the midst of many demands pressing for immediate solutions. (Wk. 7)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Week of "Economic Groundwork" in Kapini HDP sees arrival of maize and fertilizer for 40-acre scheme, 100 farmers meeting to discuss starting a co-op, Kapini HDP Credit Union briefing attended by 130 enthusiastic residents, the first Lusaka Guardians' Meeting bringing new depth of commitment, letter from the President's Office to EEC verifying government support of the Kapini HDP, the distribution of seed packets to Kapini HDP families for home gardens, the graduation of 10 farm trainees and grand Independence Day celebration with iron men marching off to their stakes at 6:00 AM to plant new "freedom (notice) boards" in each stake node.

Internal: High level spirit spin on the "missing blue radio" and ecclesiola conversation on "The Enemy" lend humor and perspective to the contingencies of corporate living.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between the main road and the Project site before the rains set in. (Wk. 7)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Guild meeting of 60 plus caps week of painting water tank and introduction of hydroponic garden in community kitchen. Marmalade worth \$120 is sold. Village Project director assumes mantle with decision to be at the collegium table every morning.

Internal: House decor blitz renews space.

Contradiction: Maintaining necessary authorization for village acceleration. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Young man from Muslim village, previously trained as health caretaker, becomes Project bookkeeper. Larry Williamson, commercial attache from American Embassy, joins Lanphear for site visit in Kamweleni and is very impressed with progress and possibilities in Project, and plans to take Ambassador at later date. Agriculture guild meets quota towards full planting of each team's acre as held in new management testimonies of gratitude from local residents as vision of future unfolds. One hundred bags of cement release "log jam" for construction industry after many weeks of no cement. Kawangware Voice rolls off the press in time for VM in Kawangware.

Internal: Two all-night finance meetings in House break loose budgets in all arenas.

Contradiction: Coordinating the multiplicity of demands structurally. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Kamweleni is energized by community meeting led by community leader Mzee Ndolo and a moving speech by blind elder Mzee Kalai. A massive step is made in framing as a high-powered community delegation visits five top level government officials in one day, and District Commissioner assures full support. KHDP is invited to serve on two district-wide planning committees to determine spending of 200 million shillings. District Commissioner gives nod to Village Meetings in every village in the Machakos Integrated Development Project—200 villages. Kamweleni HDP is selected as a demonstration health program for the Machakos Integrated Development Project area, and a commitment is made for a resident Clinical Officer, paramedic with advanced training, to staff community dispensary. Government commits staff and medications for an immediate interim weekly clinic in the Health Outpost and a community-wide malaria suppression campaign.

Internal: House sings for six hours all the Other World, Love and Pop/Folk songs, in a marathon troop revival.

Contradiction: Enabling every auxiliary to stand on death ground. (Wk. 4)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Preparations are made for Continental Council. The completion of 20 Consults is celebrated. The opening of the ninth HDTS and the arrival of 29 *ambar charkha* (yarn) spinning machines for Chikhale are portents of victory.

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Village meeting consenses to begin Sikroar Human Development Project with December 10-16 Consult. First workday levels the road into the village with 100 participants. Guardian slide show/cocktail party gets promises of authorization, cash and volunteer doctors.

Internal: J. S. Dethe visits Sikroar to begin community center/House design as House celebrates the last Diwali Festival in Delhi.

Contradiction: Coordinating schedules to release troop effectiveness. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

External: Personal invitations are delivered to metro colleagues during visitation campaign to attend two upcoming metro events. First edition of area UPDATE is mailed.

Internal: House opens bank account, symbolizing to establishment that ICA office in Calcutta is serious about intent to work in this area.

Contradiction: Shifting established operating images on other side of this week's Continental Council. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Guardian visits begin Development work in Singapore and introduce new staff. Permeation appointments uncover promising job possibilities.

Internal: Celebrative lunch of *Tim Sum* (Chinese) at Shangri-La Hotel to send out Bill and Sheila Westre, includes Sheila's parents who toast new assignment to Chicago.

Contradiction: Contacting local Guardians in Singapore while meeting demands outside of Singapore. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Health caretakers build eradication battleplan with government health workers for tuberculosis and malaria. Tadika attendance is up 40%. Garbage barrels are cut and signs painted by stakes. Industry boat design for ferro-cement is completed. Bi-monthly report is published. Opposition party leader begins new involvement by building bus stop and offering use of house.

Internal: Judy Appenfelder arrives and area prior visits.

Contradiction: Using the existing frame to achieve radical economic expansion. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: All three tractors are in working condition, busy plowing, planting, and spreading fertilizer on demonstration plots. The pasar (village market) opens on Wednesday and is sold out of all fish and vegetables every day. House moves 30 metal drums, tractors, and two unrepairable jeeps out of ICA front yard and down to agricultural complex. Singapore Development strengthens co-op power and goes on 16 appointments, tying together British company contacts, systematizing data on contacts, following up on past contacts and generally "flogging up a froth." Followup on a January appointment in Penang prompts Kampulan Barkat representative site visit on Friday and promise of M\$1,000. Saturday Lam Soon site visit prompts M\$1,350 check on Monday morning.

Internal: House sends out Rob Jennings-Teats and Joani Fleshman to Serusup after completing Serusup document publication in both English and Malay with all parts inked and help of secretary typing 80 pages of Malay over the weekend.

Contradiction: Getting the news out to total community that the flurry of activity they see is a signal of Sungai Lui getting ready to show itself to the world. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Staff and villager visit tapioca chip factory and Indonesian People's Bank to collect information about government rice program. U.S. delegation to World Forestry visits Kelapa Dua. Nests are finished for second chicken house. Chickens begin laying with 30 eggs total in first five days. Maneuvers are planned for two months with 20 villagers participating in the planning. Philips Ralin Electronics shows videotape of the movie, *The Message*, to Kelapa Dua village and staff. USAID proposal rewrite is submitted. House receives Indonesian government letter of permission for Bontoa Project.

Internal: Udin, first Kelapa Dua villager, joins the staff.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with fantastic breakloose. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: After being silent during weekly maneuver planning, village women come forth and plan their own *gotung royong* (work day) and gather to lay plans for a *pandan* (weaving) and a sewing industry.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates the completion of an enclosed kitchen with a feast of chicken curry by catching one of the chickens that had previously invaded the kitchen area daily.

Contradiction: Releasing the village to participate in the planning instead of turning to ICA as answer. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Maneuvers for Phase I (November) are enthusiastically consensed upon by 75 villagers after two nights of community meeting, and the greatness of planning is realized.

Internal: Saturday night creation of weekly time design allows effective use of time and holds the necessary tension between the auxiliary and village time designs.

Contradiction: Forming the Bontoa guilds quickly to empower the emerging village leadership. (Wk. 7)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Exciting reports are given by Ken Hamje on Bontoa Consult and Don Clark on Area Tokyo. Nexus sends out Development treks to Philippines (Davao and Manila) and Japan, Ken Hamje to Hai Ou HDP, and Don Clark on his way to be the Wedge in Area Sydney.

Internal: Celebrative ecclesiola is joined by the Hong Kong House with wine and cheese and attendance at Javanese dance performance.

Contradiction: Enabling Movement to continually stand present to the social contradictions in the five nations. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The second round of negotiations between the Nam Wai Foundation Ltd. and land development companies takes place as the final day for completing sale of all individually owned land to the Foundation approaches. At the end of a Development trek, \$1,000 USD is received, two checks are in the mail and one large donation is promised.

Internal: A study of *Our Corporate Vocation* catalyzes creative reflection on both individuals' journeys and the profound function of an order in history.

Contradiction: Maintaining a long-range vision without being swallowed up by the short-range advantages. (Wk. 5)

Contradiction: Communicating data about issues and priorities across the area, economically and timely. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: First draft mock-up of revised and polished Town Meeting workbook for Taiwan is finished.

Internal: Ecclesiola encounters the film *Network* for sodality.

Contradiction: Keeping nose to ground on TM model-building without "ants in pants" regarding authorization. (Wk. 7)

Internal: Mathew Clark has a Halloween birthday party on his fourth birthday and the House visits the Kibuki Theatre on Culture Day.

Contradiction: Securing Japanese staff while wrestling with gaps in present maneuvers. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: All the Kwang Yung villagers decide to use the common grain mill that they had built. The village tractor gets well used during the planting season. Preschool has fantastic trip to new Jeju site as part of the curriculum of this week. The auxiliary visits the Saemaul section in Seoul and also USAID director.

Internal: House celebrates permeation breakloose of two new English classes.

Contradiction: Unblocking communication, common story and symbols for the village. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Project funding leaps with promises of \$1000 grant from agricultural union and \$4000 long-term loan from government.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Miraculous Million Development workshop is held with Guardians and gives birth to the *Sunbelt Serenade*.

Internal: House welcomes Asherton staff and citizens, Development trek, authorization trek, area prior, Oklahoma City prior and extended family for week's swirl of events.

Contradiction: Holding the tension of quality saturation events using short set-up model with only two staff in the field. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Preschool teachers set up several events to secure funds for continued operation, including a flea market and a 14-mile jog-a-thon. Town Meeting: Mississippi funding of \$25,000 (half of the proposal) is allocated from the governor's office.

Internal: Walters and Moriarty visit to formulate nine-month maneuvers with auxiliary.

Contradiction: Prioritizing individual and corporate to-do lists in order to maximize troop engagement and ensure success. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: House begins second maneuver with colleagues in kind room and board, resulting in nine events scheduled for the next two weeks.

Internal: House Church with Frs. Winus and Rock and Zufalls from Baton Rouge celebrates the 45th anniversary of the Gee's, Mollie's parents.

Contradiction: Moving troops in to maneuver areas so that awakenment events and Development can be secured, all of which are just beyond our fingertips and waiting to be seized. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Alamo, Tennessee Town Meeting is held with 37 present. State of Mississippi approves funding for 100 Town Meetings in half of the state. Arkansas circuiting is set up.

Internal: House enjoys visit in beautiful weather to the Memphis Zoo with a picnic afterwards.

Contradiction: Looking ahead to next stronghold while still engaged in polishing off the present one. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First two saturation events are held: a CYF of 95 and a Town Meeting with local song, story and symbol workshop leaders. Development arrives to spiritize first slide show and puts realistic meat on funding anxieties.

Internal: Bay window is painted after months of struggle to complete the job.

Contradiction: Discerning necessary victories and pulling together events that will polish off the *Carter Country Call Maneuver*. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: First experiment with saturation results in four events in Gibson HDP in five days with 75 adults and 160 children participating. Visiting impact team expands staff's imagination with global stories and reports.

Internal: Order Youth impact House with musical program in sodality.

Contradiction: Concretizing guild plans. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Calls to a Jewish synagogue in Miami inquire about Imaginal Education. Fourth Task Force on churchwide education uses maneuver methods in setting up tasks for the next quarter.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a fine event as prolegomena discussion draws a response of "they don't teach things like this in school, do they?" from one of the youth and conversation on creative tension informs and heals.

Contradiction: Turning the vulnerability of "working alone" from paralysis to purposeful action. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Canadian paper company Vice President commits \$15,000 and requests to be on ICA Board. One thousand more TM workbooks are inked. Five GWFs are staffed, with 150 participants and 35 regional faculty trained.

Internal: The finest dancing Academy ever holds a grand ball.

Contradiction: Focusing imagery of three campaigns on new orbit. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Health Outpost representatives meet with Cook County Board of Health and Hospitals Governing Commission to begin arrangements on a cooperative venture to reopen health outpost. Commercial school is ready to open next week with 15 registrations. Economic team visits Ivy City to work on urban showcase proposals.

Internal: The Chicago House welcomes the Mueller family and holds a birthday party for two members of the House.

Contradiction: Hiding behind a mountain of tasks in order to avoid tackling the intimidating ones. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Twenty-five people attend Christmas planning meeting and decide on four Friday evenings for major activities beginning with a festival December 1st. Development gets off to a good start with \$1350 in hand from two corporations and several key referrals.

Internal: Two celebrations in one week: ecclesiola and a Mexican dinner Saturday night provide refreshing discontinuity as mission intensifies.

Contradiction: Turning excitement with the quarter's maneuvers into regular engagement through Christmas. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Everyone gets off to Guardian Consult in Chicago. New Thursday night planning format introduces weekly maneuvering for the entire metro to enable the region.

Internal: House Church, shifted to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, the first of the quarter's experiments, seems to hold the transition to Week I in a new way.

Contradiction: Keeping the foundations (materials and logistics) firmly in place as launching for strongholding. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: House trains 18 pedagogues in Economic Community Forum, GWF, and CYF. The signal is getting inside constructs to profundity of events and marketing cues.

Internal: House has an event-filled day with two visits from Fire Department and ecclesiola on "passing over."

Contradiction: Delivering skills and resources through cross-pollination of regional creativity and global resource of HDP data. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Town Meeting is set and Assembly site is chosen for saturation events Weeks 7, 8, 9. Other towns are working toward dates.

Internal: Metro colleagues come Sunday for maneuver planning and House Church.

Contradiction: Building formulation of colleagues into saturation scheme. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Forty-one Mill Shoals residents participate in first stake meetings. All recruitment is done by stake hosts. Plans for the future are made. Staff inkind \$1,000 worth of coal for auxiliary House heat and tile for the Town Hall. Town Hall is given face lift in Saturday workday.

Internal: Area prior's visit pushes comprehensiveness and provides House with spirit refreshment.

Contradiction: Laying groundwork for intensified community engagement and participation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Regional economic task force meets with mayor, council members and Land Use Guild to report on research and funding possibilities. Canteen holds grand opening with 25 Kinney youth celebrating their summer's work.

Internal: Collegiums for quarter are set with five rationales for edge, study, HDP skills, methods and visibility, and 50 skeleton constructs are drawn up.

Contradiction: Clarifying purpose of EDA trek in order to tie all Project activities into one focus. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Entire tri-metro is assigned to five micro teams to set up stronghold events. Allen Bradley Corporation calls to ask where to send the check.

Internal: Ecclesiola combines encounter with John Dunne with metro meeting for a sodality using war room decor charts.

Contradiction: Doing stronghold strategy through an effective plan which shows the need for "a calling to colleagues." (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Top of the state stronghold (November 2—December 2) is launched with two paying Town Meetings and one presentation which does all the set up, including \$100 local funding. Structures of the church are impacted with presentations at state-wide United Churchmen Conference, Methodist Board of Human Relations and World Peace and in-service workshop at St. Andrews School on charting as a classroom method.

Internal: Lafayette and Indianapolis cadres begin study of *The Way Of All The Earth* and gala House Church sends out Meg Wildhack to Kapini HDP.

Contradiction: Pushing through the recruiters and advocates to insure stronghold completion, GWF and RS-1. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Hamilton, Ohio, saturation series is climaxed in spirited assembly. Over 600 people (.5% of the population) participated. New Town Meeting requests keep coming in.

Internal: House celebrates five month extension of rent-free facility with grand meal at the Magic Wok restaurant.

Contradiction: Building a Kentucky Town Meeting story that includes present advantages and fills in authorization gaps. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Exciting Town Meetings are held in villages of Alger County in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, reaching 10% of village populations. Munising and Manistique plan second annual Town Meetings, one in conjunction with Youth Forum.

Internal: House canoes on Lake AuTrain, less than a mile from Lake Superior, finding the good life of the stronghold.

Contradiction: Telling the story effectively across the whole region. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council is highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: House, metro, Development Centrum and area strike force cooperate in an all-day bank blitz to 13 banks in Manhattan. Guardians from the area meet in New York to plan the December global Guardians meeting in Area New York.

Internal: Evening task force meets to launch a serious regional Development push.

Contradiction: Phasing a realistic rhythm to insure that saturation happens. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: First TM of the Armstrong County Stronghold Maneuver is a winner and moves two regional colleagues to call communities for set-up and recruitment of future TMs.

Internal: Shift to early supper and related enablement timeline leaves double time for Day II engagement.

Contradiction: Creating the winning story in unknown towns. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Saturation of Seneca Lake area yields six firm dates and seven more strong possibilities which will require follow up. One Town Meeting is set up by phone in the midst of Halloween goblins interrupting both ends of the conversation.

Internal: "Immortals" leave House with Miraculous Million Maneuver and plan for the arrival of the area strike force team to do Day I Development calls in response to the Seneca Lakes meetings.

Contradiction: Assuring a multiple direction approach to recruitment which will assure the success of the Seneca Lake meetings. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes. Ten Development appointments take place with five more scheduled for next week. The Galbreaths attend the Guardian Consult in Chicago.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: A significant turn in economic activity in the Project is signaled by team presence working on EDA/HUD applications for 5th City and Ivy City, a \$9,000 week in the printshop, \$500 in hand from Town Meeting campaign, and four researchers on stipend beginning research on Ivy City's changing face.

Internal: Collegiums look at the shadow principle and learnings in the urban.

Contradiction: Recovering a rhythm for significant engagement to cover the total scope of our activities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Spontaneous workday on school holiday nets two more rooms of preschool operational, just in time for preschool mothers' meeting.

Internal: Ecclesiola dances of awakening and engagement symbolize Project's engagement possibilities that have been developed in the past month.

Contradiction: Daring to take yet another step to put the bottom of the mountain in touch with the top to get the store in operation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Metro meeting moves to North Philadelphia for the first time as a sign of House's seriousness about raising up local leadership. Attendance quadruples, releasing new forces to participate in the planning of the *Evening at the Institute*, in the framing of CYF and in the events of the Harrisburg stronghold.

Internal: Asking Bananeiras consultant to host Week II celebration and de-briefing after day-on-the-turf in Harrisburg reveals new way to catalyze local participation in the stronghold.

Contradiction: Concretizing decision to win by building a logistical support base that includes reconfigured office space. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Two members of the area strike force team rendezvous with metro colleagues on Saturday morning for a day of calling in Patterson Metro, dramatizing again the importance of Week II's in saturation maneuvers. A great celebration at Don and Jan Baker's house at end of day includes their slides from Murrin Bridge and Sudtonggan.

Internal: House welcomes Susan Antenen as sojourner and sends out Ruth Walker to Academy.

Contradiction: Phasing a realistic rhythm to ensure saturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Fact sheet distribution, stake visiting, and core meeting increase commitment following questions raised by newspaper articles.

Internal: Saturday's workday with six regional colleagues moves along firewood garnering, House winterization and move out of old dwelling.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of depth breakthrough and maintaining it by constant push on spirit. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Dates and facilities begin to shape up in Bridgeport. New Development brochure, designed by the House, is sent out through the efforts of three metro colleagues. Two others spend time on the phone.

Internal: House and Development team attend movie *The Big Fix* about the protest movement in the 60's and where they are now.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with accelerating demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Visits to set up economic PSU, both inside and outside the community, give different perspective on community and reveal a readiness to move.

Internal: Electrical system and gray water drainage system create signs of permanence.

Contradiction: Soliciting a new depth of engagement in the community. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House hosts committee meeting made up of eight of Those Who Care. Group sets dates and begins work on two forums in the stronghold neighborhood of Whittenton.

Internal: House is impacted by global and areal events during collegiums by Maharashtra monther and area prior.

Contradiction: Shoring up a training event and Assembly in order to transform individual forums into stronghold happening. (Wk. 6)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Saturation funding is underway in the Gaspé of Quebec with \$200 gift from Roman Catholic Bishop to pay for one Community Forum.

Internal: Metro colleagues from Montreal Area move into forefront, providing leadership for ecclesiola and gifts of consolation for injured Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Seeing beyond the nitty gritty demands of translation, funding proposals and GCF set-up to next saturation stronghold. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Task force blitz, *Golden Horseshoe Strike*, creates a brochure and Development letter, and mails it to 200 companies in preparation for the raising of \$6000.

Internal: Area prior's visit brings the news of saturation and Development breakthroughs.

Contradiction: Getting the long-range plans and the short-range implementaries done when the four House members all have different hours. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Development and authorization have a "true and beautiful" week as 26 out of 26 visits produce all requested, and sometimes more.

Internal: Internal life celebrations come alive with poetry reading in Saturday evening ecclesiola and birthday celebration, and guest night on Thursday.

Contradiction: Formulating troops in the course of the set up and preparation going on now. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Everyone is engaged as four combine Guardian Consult with research/marketing trip covering two nations, nine states, three provinces and three time zones. Six cabinetmakers take two-day trip to provincial furniture factories. Adult education center opens with two classrooms and a library.

Internal: The phoenix arises with the securing of a new three-bedroom furnished mobile home for nine months in kind and the birth of Dara Elise Stringham, seven and one half pounds, October 10th.

Contradiction: Getting immediate funds for programs which need short-term funding before winter comes, in the midst of long-term funding plan. (Wk. 6)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Several visits by government agencies produce breakthroughs in the arenas of housing, parasite and mosquito control, and facilities construction.

Internal: War room is transformed with new area names, Latin American grid over map and cleaning blitz.

Contradiction: Building focus and eventfulness into weekly design. (Wk. 7)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Two community members, Raul Jorquera and Jose' Duran are sent to the Project in Brazil on exchange program with Bananeiras. New reading and intellectual development program is begun with youth. Eleven Development appointments are made as new office system is begun. After teaching a four-week course, sewing teacher decides to remain in community and become part of auxiliary.

Internal: One of two auxiliary housing units is repaired with new rooms created and running water installed to receive two new auxiliary members.

Contradiction: Finding ways of moving from planning small programs and details to more complex and longer-range programs. (Wk. 7)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Special forces arrive to vaccinate villagers against tuberculosis. Bakeries are visited in Silva Jardim and Rio Bonito as lard is donated for community bakery. The lettuce crop is selling well; tomatoes in two weeks. Major Development breakthrough happens as request for philanthropic status in Brasil is pushed through. Major donor agrees to provide services as an umbrella agency to Bananeiras contributions.

Internal: Workday creates village demonstration garden at House, capped off with Irish celebration.

Contradiction: Finding the gimmick that will move the community beyond one-by-one participation to raise up a core of community leadership. (Wk. 6)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: A week of visitors is highlighted by a visit from Bishop Herbert Edmundson and members of the Anglican Church Army who are incredulous to discover that this is only the second quarter of the first year of the Project.

Internal: Jim Stovall is sent out with *dupe* (ghost) stories ringing in his ears after conducting four CYFs and setting up 23 more with Anglican and Catholic youth groups.

Contradiction: Putting self-conscious structure on the guilds. (Wk. 7)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Possibilities swirl as three adults prepare to train as teachers in Conacaste's new wicker products industry. A doctor, the Director General of UNICEF Guatemala, opens hospital doors to any sick child from the village. UNICEF donates much-needed cooking utensils, as well as sewing machines, which inspires local resident to offer a room in her home for sewing classes. A Guatemalan engineering company buys a pump and motor for the first irrigation demonstration in the Project.

Internal: Motorcycle population of the auxiliary doubles, as two new "Motos," one given by UNICEF, arrive with a roar and flourish, thus aiding in traveling the three kilometers of bad road.

Contradiction: Developing funding to back up the new opportunities offered by gifts in diverse arenas. (Wk. 6)

WEEK SEVEN

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports victories toward the miraculous million continue with two individual commitments for \$160,000 and \$30,000, Reynolds Tobacco \$103,600 (for January), and HUD \$15,000. Cross-centrum coordination empowers corporate thrust of Nexus. Global Development discovers a new willingness of people to hear our story. The key contradiction lies in the arena of developing a system of tracking monies which adequately envelopes all of the complexities.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Chicago Centrum is experimenting with new conversation methods as an indirect means of working with Dunne's insights. Cross-centrum task forces revise three more modules for the HDTS: Fifth City and work on the preparation of the Community Center for the School. Concentration of Centrum energy on preparation of the Quarter III ecclesiola during evenings is yielding fruit. The key contradiction lies in the arena of clarifying the focus of futuric needs in leadership training and spirit nurture.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the Salani Consult is staffed by SEAPAC and entire launching is undergirded by long-time Samoan colleagues. All-day debriefing by Global Impact Systems Post results in remaneuvering, in anticipation of North America Priors Council. Bob St. Clair is sent to Charlotteville HDP, having already done detailed, implementary back-up on firewood processing industry. Global Operations Centrum at Brussels Nexus gets out on first circuit of the European Houses to participate in remaneuvering and planning. The key contradiction lies in the arena of keeping supply lines ahead of the troops.

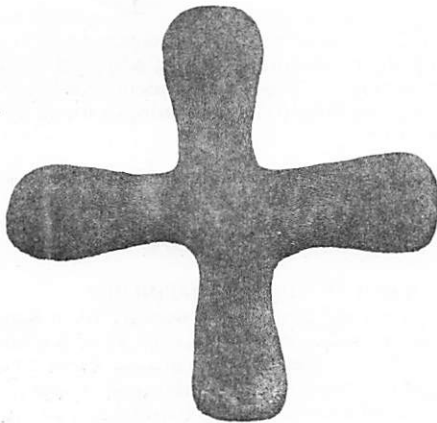
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports program, sustenance and stipend checks go out, marking the establishment of the year's system in Brussels. Chicago Management receives funds and Religious House reports for August through October from Hong Kong. Chicago inkinds paper and printing for 1000 workbooks. A full set of reports received from Lagos House marks the first African response in regularizing financial systems with all African locations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting the data on finances, materials and man-hours objectified so that futuric decisions can be made.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: First Tai'rgwaith/Isle of Dogs Project interchange is actuated with weekend in Tai'rgwaith. Highlights include the practical experience of being part of a network of demonstration projects by local people and decision of Kath Sim to "wear the blue" and self-consciously care for women in Tai'rgwaith. Two GWFs and two CYFs are firm for London Metro Weeks 8-9. Framing continues with visits to YWCA and National Council of Women who give strong affirmation of work.

Internal: House attends *The Girlfriends* as part of ecclesiola and meet John Dunne with great anticipation of the study.

Contradiction: Building the whole bridge with only one fourth of the planks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Phoning for Panchayat evenings draws responses from old colleagues and from recent contacts too. Aberdeen TM stronghold follow up continues.

Internal: Paul and Ruth Dyhr are assigned to House, doubling troop strength immediately.

Contradiction: Learning how to present a positive objective presence, rather than being seen as a threat. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: *Vision* is produced by local publications task force. Five people spearhead membership drive for Friendly Society and over 100 families join. Management Committee is elected next evening, thus establishing Project legal body. Village women meet and plan community-large celebration and GWF, and ICA staff are invited to meeting.

Internal: House women go to GWF pedagogy while men put out the newspapers and watch local rugby match, demonstrating the power of the surprise maneuver.

Contradiction: Training leadership already in position to move on the complexities of Human Development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Various events launch Manchester and New Castle strongholds as circuiter and House members attend minister colleague induction, Young Christian Workers meeting, show Social Demonstration slides to New Castle Robin Hood Gang youth, and hold two potential steering committee meetings.

Internal: Permeator lands first temporary job while continuing permanent job interviews and traveling to London for GWF pedagogy—all in same day.

Contradiction: Creating a "rider" for strongholds that embodies the urgency of the mission. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Week of Development opens contacts with religious orders in Paris. Slide show with 20 Oblate and Benedictine Sisters is highlighted with opening address given by Bishop Mathews.

Internal: The House is honored by an Indian curry dinner prepared by Bishop and Mrs. Mathews and gift of a bottle of wine from Cana, Israel.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum going on two fronts at once. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The *Cooperativa Artiganale* (Industrial Co-op) signs legal document. Ten members celebrate with champagne. Guardian event in Rome with Panchayat promises further help with marketing and authorization. Two staff are invited to guild family wedding feast. Town Meeting is set up and assisted by two Terminese.

Internal: Panchayat visitation with Vance, Epps, Parker, Pesek and Lyn Mathews brings welcome pause and opportunity for global objectivity and news.

Contradiction: Recruiting Italian circuiters to keep up with the openness of Italian villages and networks. (Wk. 7)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP,

External: Ibadan circuit sets up six CYFs for Weeks 11 and 12, and GWF for Week 9. In kind bulldozer arrives and clears most of industrial park site in four days. Sewing factory begins production on new contract for pillows and makes 500 plus in one day. Four kilos of tomatoes are sold to Kingsway for high price, breaking loose Commerce Guild. Development begins to reap results of Guardians Meeting with 1300 nira in hand.

Internal: House sends out Lin Wisman to North America with Yoruba celebration, including 40 guests from the village, eba and fish stew, and lots of singing.

Contradiction: Providing expertise beyond that of the staff. (Wk. 8)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The Guardians' event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakening and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyshock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Twenty Guardians welcome Panchayat and actively participate in workshop on Dorpsdag, as well as volunteering time and offering hostelry. One more colleague joins circuit force.

Internal: Sr. Yvonne Guenec from France breaks open religious order facility possibilities in the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Operating out of contradiction-oriented, rather than goal-oriented, images of victory. (Wk. 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: After the fantastic Nieder Henninger TM held at the Frankfurt House, within three days the circuiters set up five more TMs—four of which are in new polises—as well as hold the TM they hit the road to do this week. In a 20 minute Development call, pastor of the Reformed Church predicts he will raise at least USD 5,000 to 8,000 from his church after HDP slide show which he scheduled for January.

Internal: Movitivity hits a new level as two teams go out to do TM circuits while another goes out to do Development, leaving the folks at home to enjoy a fine ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Figuring out how to demonstrate in 216 polises that they have no problems, only challenges. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Third neighborhood cross-street TM is big success and results in decision to meet again. The Christmas market flyer is printed and local merchants begin donating money for the Christmas trees to be put along Wrangelstrasse. Development takes off with 14 calls on local industries and submittal of proposal for USD 6,200 for Volksfest and promise from Borchner. District approves plans for Block 121 Community Center and owner of building agrees to a pre-contract.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic explodes as Paula Philbrook arrives on Operations trek, Brian Williams on Development trek, Ross Stuart on European trek, Margaret Blummer in preparation to go to Cano Negro, student from Heidelberg to see what's going on and Guardian brings a friend by to learn about the Project.

Contradiction: Meeting resistant winds in arena of tactical actualization. (Wk. 8)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Week of "Economic Groundwork" in Kapini HDP sees arrival of maize and fertilizer for 40-acre scheme, 100 farmers meeting to discuss starting a co-op, Kapini HDP Credit Union briefing attended by 130 enthusiastic residents, the first Lusaka Guardians' Meeting bringing new depth of commitment, letter from the President's Office to EEC verifying government support of the Kapini HDP, the distribution of seed packets to Kapini HDP families for home gardens, the graduation of 10 farm trainees and grand Independence Day celebration with iron men marching off to their stakes at 6:00 AM to plant new "freedom(notice) boards" in each stake node.

Internal: High level spirit spin on the "missing blue radio" and ecclesiola conversation on "The Enemy" lend humor and perspective to the contingencies of corporate living.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between the main road and the Project site before the rains set in. (Wk. 7)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Guild meeting of 60 plus caps week of painting water tank and introduction of hydroponic garden in community kitchen. Marmalade worth \$120 is sold. Village Project director assumes mantle with decision to be at the collegium table every morning.

Internal: House decor blitz renews space.

Contradiction: Maintaining necessary authorization for village acceleration. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Mr. Jordan Lewis of Appropriate Technology International has site visit in Kawangware and states as he leaves, "From what I have seen and heard, I will be a supporter of ICA's work around the globe". COMARTKA's prices for banana fiber products are raised 30% by local buyer which begins to bring them into profitable articles. Heifer Project International comes through with 80,000 Kenya shillings for livestock and technicians after watching the mails for two years. Guild meeting is led by Joram Ng'ang'a (Manager in Agriculture) and established leadership of Kawangware. Village Meeting number 84 is carried out in the rain with Assistant Chief, Mr. J. Kibe-Ragae, as Master of Ceremonies.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality focused on health in Kawangware gives new clarity on "vehicle" through which Project can move, an ambulance service.

Contradiction: Pre-planning corporately to include every detail to win the victory. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Kamweleni is energized by community meeting led by community leader Mzee Ndolo and a moving speech by blind elder Mzee Kalai. A massive step is made in framing as a high-powered community delegation visits five top level government officials in one day, and District Commissioner assures full support. KHDP is invited to serve on two district-wide planning committees to determine spending of 200 million shillings. District Commissioner gives nod to Village Meetings in every village in the Machakos Integrated Development Project—200 villages.

Internal: House sings for six hours all the Other World, Love and Pop/Folk songs, in a marathon troop revival.

Contradiction: Enabling every auxiliary to stand on death ground. (Wk. 4)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Renewal of the sub-continent decision to do 232 by July 31, 1979 marks Council held at Sevagram Ashram. The selfhood and confidence of the National Project Directors prompts Ashram leaders to state that with Nava Gram Prayas the vision of the Mahatma is being fulfilled.

Internal: Nexus sends out first Maharashtra Month team to report and recruit for November Consults, and receives Eric Dimitriov for three months of agricultural work and Maruti for box factory training for Gorthan.

Contradiction: Focusing Council breakthrough into concrete weekly plans. (Wk. 8)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Village meeting consenses to begin Sikroar Human Development Project with December 10-16 Consult. First workday levels the road into the village with 100 participants. Guardian slide show/cocktail party gets promises of authorization, cash and volunteer doctors.

Internal: J. S. Dethe visits Sikroar to begin community center/House design as House celebrates the last Diwali Festival in Delhi.

Contradiction: Coordinating schedules to release troop effectiveness. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Personal invitations are delivered to metro colleagues during visitation campaign to attend two upcoming metro events. First edition of area UPDATE is mailed.

Internal: House opens bank account, symbolizing to establishment that ICA office in Calcutta is serious about intent to work in this area.

Contradiction: Shifting established operating images on other side of this week's Continental Council. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Guardian visits begin Development work in Singapore and introduce new staff. Permeation appointments uncover promising job possibilities.

Internal: Celebrative lunch of *Tim Sum* (Chinese) at Shangri-La Hotel to send out Bill and Sheila Westre, includes Sheila's parents who toast new assignment to Chicago.

Contradiction: Contacting local Guardians in Singapore while meeting demands outside of Singapore. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Health caretakers build eradication battleplan with government health workers for tuberculosis and malaria. Tadika attendance is up 40%. Garbage barrels are cut and signs painted by stakes. Industry boat design for ferro-cement is completed. Bi-monthly report is published. Opposition party leader begins new involvement by building bus stop and offering use of house.

Internal: Judy Appenfelder arrives and area prior visits.

Contradiction: Using the existing frame to achieve radical economic expansion. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: The gift of living in a multi-cultural nation provides a Monday off as House joins in the Indian celebration, "Holiday of Lights." Four days of site visits: two different news journal reporters who create such excitement in their offices that two more come to Sungai Lui HDP unofficially; the Belgium Embassy and Australian High Commission representatives visit with the children chiming out "hello" as they tour; chicken farm set-up people follow before the coffee pot gets cold. To relieve the flow of mud brought by the rainy season, staff dig a trench in morning only to find neighbor extending it further in the afternoon.

Internal: House welcomes new intern from Kuala Lumpur, Indran Ganesem, and sends out Ruthe Yost to Singapore for Project coordination meeting.

Contradiction: Building the structural bridge between the newly developed private ventures and the corporate structures that form all of these into a village company. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Staff and villager visit tapioca chip factory and Indonesian People's Bank to collect information about government rice program. U.S. delegation to World Forestry visits Kelapa Dua. Nests are finished for second chicken house. Chickens begin laying with 30 eggs total in first five days.

Internal: Udin, first Kelapa Dua villager, joins the staff.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with fantastic breakloose. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: After being silent during weekly maneuver planning, village women come forth and plan their own *gotung royong* (work day) and gather to lay plans for a *pandan* (weaving) and a sewing industry.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates the completion of an enclosed kitchen with a feast of chicken curry by catching one of the chickens that had previously invaded the kitchen area daily.

Contradiction: Releasing the village to participate in the planning instead of turning to ICA as answer. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Maneuvers for Phase I (November) are enthusiastically consensued upon by 75 villagers after two nights of community meeting, and the greatness of planning is realized.

Internal: Saturday night creation of weekly time design allows effective use of time and holds the necessary tension between the auxiliary and village time designs.

Contradiction: Forming the Bontoa guilds quickly to empower the emerging village leadership. (Wk. 7)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: HDTs begins with 60 plus staff in Sudtonggan with 12 nations represented. Participants include three Australian Aborigines.

Internal: Don Clark enroute from Wedge trek in Australia to Seoul reports on breakthroughs in the Year of Australia.

Contradiction: Giving people permission to operate in the local situation in total freedom while embodying the corporate consensus. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The second round of negotiations between the Nam Wai Foundation Ltd. and land development companies takes place as the final day for completing sale of all individually owned land to the Foundation approaches.

Internal: A study of *Our Corporate Vocation* catalyzes creative reflection on both individuals' journeys and the profound function of an order in history.

Contradiction: Maintaining a long-range vision without being swallowed up by the short-range advantages. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: News of more than one million USD new investments since Project has begun (94% by the villagers, 4% government, 2% donors) is presented at guild meeting. One day miracle builds auxiliary kitchen in preparation for pre-school and auxiliary re-location.

Internal: First English class with 25 people is held at Trans Horizon micro-wave station.

Contradiction: Establishing authentic image of pioneering in the village. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Philippine portion of 1978-79 area Development budget (110,000 USD) is committed in two week Development blitz. AID check is in hand. Possible quantum leap is sighted in marketing Sudtonggan HDP crafts and in developing craft industry as auxiliary and two villagers visit 15 Manila top exporters.

Internal: House hosts HDTs global staff enroute to Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Communicating data about issues and priorities across the area, economically and timely. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Phase I maneuver timeline for TM "Taiwan Gold" campaign is completed with materials production in full swing, including 12-page participants' workbook and implementation brief for villages and local government offices.

Internal: ICA financial books are updated through October 31 in preparation for first audit in Taiwan in early January, 1979.

Contradiction: Pushing vision out ahead at least two years while immediately resolving ICA Development status with the government and initiating nation-wide TM campaign. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Sixty participants, 20 staff and 100 guests from cluster villages open HDTs with great feast. All Training School decor is built and prepared by Sudtonggan villagers. Craft marketing continues with visits from representatives from Sweden, Manila and World Bank.

Internal: School receives Horishi Fukuyama, Bronyun Rees and Lloyd Johnson into HDTs staff.

Contradiction: Speeding up timeline for new second level Sudtonggan HDP leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New quarter begins with large community assembly which establishes consensus to have weekly community meetings. Demonstration Japanese earthbank kiln for brick industry is completed. Marketing and research team to expand sewing industry hits the road. Frame for community nursery is completed and seeds obtained. Yearly Langub fiesta is celebrated with cultural show from the University of Mindanao. Construction for the Training Center/staff house begins anew. A second day care center with 31 children opens in Mojon stake.

Internal: House welcomes Ben and Leoncita Potot and seven children, Rudy and Miguela Tero and two children, Godofredo and Dalinay Estorgio and six children, and Susan Amistoso from Sudtonggan as new staff for the year.

Contradiction: Getting a regular supply system into existence. (Wk. 5)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Town Meetings are set up in two more prefectures, leaving three more prefectures to be visited. Development brings in \$2,300.

Internal: Mathew Clark has a Halloween birthday party on his fourth birthday and the House visits the Kibuki Theatre on Culture Day.

Contradiction: Securing Japanese staff while wrestling with gaps in present maneuvers. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: The *Village Bulletin* is again being published and distributed throughout the "bans" by villagers. Three charts explaining the organization of the Village Treasury (LEV) are placed in the Village Hall, Health Outpost and Training Center. Holt Foundation representative, Village Chief, Rev. Choi of the Methodist Church and ICA meet together to give new direction to preschool.

Internal: Eighteen Methodist seminary graduates and three Methodist pastors make site visit and discuss with the auxiliary the new role of the church.

Contradiction: Needing a practical day-to-day relationship with the village that allows maneuvering with the village for a comprehensive plan for local leadership. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Cow shed walls go up while all wait anxiously for official permission to build it. Exposure continues with visits by official from Department of Home Affairs, T.J. Coolidge, and Mr. Paek, president of local manufacturing firm.

Internal: Internal life moves away from the cold collegium center room into the imaginative relief of the two floor-heated perimeter rooms.

Contradiction: Letting loose a late fall blaze of Project activity that hot coals remain on the other side of the mid-winter village retreat. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House sets up "red alert" on circuits. Matsuyama City will look at the methods for use in its 500 local meetings. One TM is set up in Tsuwano. A Buddhist priest from prefecture comes by to talk about Town Meeting. Kathy Bauknight arrives for Development.

Internal: House hosts visitors from Tokyo, Eija and Aki Karikoski, and all attend the Russia-Japan ice skating championships.

Contradiction: Ensuring that each week has a focal point. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: LENS registration moves ahead with 16 yeses, seven of those with money in. Town Meeting set up is confirmed by post card in the mail. GWF workshop leaders and translators take time out to reflect on the seven revolutions.

Internal: Victory for the House budget comes when Maryknoll Fathers forgive loan of 242,964 yen (\$1,280).

Contradiction: Orchestrating the week so that the clever goes between the joints. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: GWF meeting with Sapporo church women sets date for GWF pedagogy. Michael Shaw is sent out on TM circuit and reports date set in November for Fukushima City. Mr. Tonosaki is sent out to Japan Guardians Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Oyubari House hosts 14 guests for informal evening on Saturday night; includes drop-in from Switzerland, making 24th nation to visit OHDP.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to Oyubari as a demonstration. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Visit to national office of Lions International opens possibility of CMA support. Week II PSUs set up designs for quarter's Guardian involvement and new meshing of external and internal mission.

Internal: House hosts Bill Newkirk en route to Jakarta forestry conference, and colleagues from Melbourne, Murrin Bridge, Canberra and Brisbane.

Contradiction: Rebuilding momentum and establishing other beachheads. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Saturation proceeds with fine demonstration CMA with the Jurien Progress Association, resulting in the setting up of a whole TM in three weeks' time.

Internal: Colleague from work and Oombulgurri work-party participant from Melbourne drop by for dinner and get the global picture on GSD and GCF happenings.

Contradiction: Finding the kick-start that will move House from a holding operation to life-and-death warfare. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Southeast circuit results in two CMA dates being set. Successful Guardians' dinner is held in small country town of Riverton, using Global Slide Show. Murrin Bridge paint team date is approved.

Internal: Hilde Betonte lands job on Thursday and is working that night.

Contradiction: Conveying the death ground to all those willing to die in the Adelaide Region. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Nine visits for state campaign advocates nets eight referrals, two yeses for state committee and date set for CMA: Springvale and expanded CTC prospect list. Cup Day miracle re-decor's office to reflect shift to CTC and CMA.

Internal: Liza Tod returns in time for special barbeque to be "the ghost of the duchess" in fun ecclesiola drama.

Contradiction: Designing the environments that will win CM committee and CTC yeses when petrol strike and holiday season seem to say no. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: After two days of tough battle at the board of review in Taxation Department, ICA emerges completely clean, with an invitation from the federal taxation commissioner's representative to further discussions on collegial base. Out of the blue comes a letter from Immigration to sit down, talk and state our requirements.

Internal: House welcomes Spencer, Clark and Oakley in middle of night and sends them out five hours later with Banks to Melbourne on authorization visits.

Contradiction: Putting down solid foundations with key government departments now that the toe is in the door. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Two site selection treks are held—the first to the West and the second to the North. Town just north of Rockhampton is offered by shire president. House inkinds Holden car parts in first call to car dealer.

Internal: Dunne study, by candlelight when power fails, illuminates war in midst of day-to-day battles.

Contradiction: Picking up on campaigns smoothly with complete troop change and frustrating lack of working cash. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Three pass first-aid course. Women begin dress-making. Murrin Bridge Magpies football team is organized by community and wins its first game. Auxiliary launches a series of guest nights with showing of GSD slides.

Internal: Wedge/area team visits and shares recent brooding on intents of the next 10 years.

Contradiction: Nurturing the signs of new decision to build community. (Wk. 8)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Major work force turns out for a community "face lift" on Saturday morning, in anticipation of a site visit from U.S. Congressional Representatives. Six truckloads of weeds (from garden and flower beds) and debris are collected and dumped in that single morning's effort.

Internal: Ecclesiola on Friday evening comes as a welcome change from doing ecclesiola after stake meetings, and not quite doing justice to either one.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum on all of the battlefield maneuvers, when half of the auxiliary staff is down with the flu virus. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: With the move into Salani Village, Consult preparation breaks loose in the arena of ink, authorization, consultant recruitment, Development and village home survey.

Internal: Move from six-room house to one room *fale* (no walls), grounds winds of change dynamic in midst of total exposure.

Contradiction: Creating new use of time and space that "moves" in the midst of dispersed corporateness. (Wk. 7)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Development trek energizes possibility of money-seeking blitz with over \$4000 in hand. LENS team secures initial yes for LENS from Hewlett Packard and Levi Strauss.

Internal: J. Dunne study relentlessly engages House in midst of mid-course remaneuvering and writing.

Contradiction: Hitting the line with a whomph, rather than a trickle. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: The Cusick community picks up the ball for the six-month celebration event and runs toward the goal of December 2. Two local men deliver a cord and a half of firewood to the pre-school site..

Internal: Four House people attend a week's VISTA training in Seattle and impact the conference with the Cusick model.

Contradiction: Doing the Cusick celebration dance wildly so that it attracts more dancers. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Twelve target strongholds are reprioritized after last four forays are completed, and a journey is charted for each one.

Internal: First attempts at food budget paring net one celebrative dinner and a \$5.00 bag of groceries.

Contradiction: Creating and executing new marching orders to deal with daily shifts in missional advantage and strategies. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Current maneuvers produce three TMs each in one day. Visits to "grads" of first maneuver prove TM is indeed an awakening event.

Internal: A pause for ecclesiola in the midst of too much to do gives everyone a second wind.

Contradiction: Creating an image of how to do urban block TMs to release key strategy. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: T-shirts go on sale at community meeting, while a plan is created for sales at Papago Rodeo. Recreation guild uses proceeds for youth activities.

Internal: House attends village send-out feast for Fr. Lambert, village Franciscan priest and colleague.

Contradiction: Catalyzing broad-based participation for extended period of time for major improvement events. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: First "Night With Institute" nets one HDP consultant and two to Cannonball workday.

Internal: First snow and cold spell hastens winterization and moving of one couple off the porch.

Contradiction: Applying the shadow principle region-wide in order to maximize troops available. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: A district planning meeting is held in the Project office (a melding of established community structures with presence of some erstwhile doubters), resulting in a grant of \$2,500 from tribal funds for Cannon Ball Industries, and six salaries for Project activities.

Internal: Three men from Chicago bring evaluative procedures that mix the community and the auxiliary in valuable goal setting sessions.

Contradiction: Maintaining a comprehensive vision and focus in the midst of an immediate crisis mind set. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Sunnyside (N.W. Denver) maneuver ends having engaged 15 colleagues, with fantastic Assembly and concrete proposals, leaving an inner city community that is ready to move! Salt Lake City plans two maneuvers for early 1979.

Internal: Celebration at House, after completion of the Sunnyside maneuver, nets fine evaluation in midst of profound collegiality.

Contradiction: Tackling the irritants and deterrents before they stall maneuver momentum. (Wk. 8)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: A completed saturation Development proposal and a Development team for the week intensifies the thrust of the Million Dollar Maneuver.

Internal: Champagne dinner celebrates the acceptance of jobs that will gross \$2072 a month, all gotten in five days.

Contradiction: Releasing the interest and intrigue of colleagues to active engagement. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Visit of Development team sees House thermometer rise to \$1400 and establishment of permanent files, tracking systems and grassroots mailing list of 500 people.

Internal: House celebrates Development break loose with local colleagues at \$100 meal donated by Keg and Cleaver restaurant.

Contradiction: Moving with power into new saturation in midst of financial squeeze. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Regional colleagues with new faces among them enable the moving of the ICA office and war room. Finishing touches are being put on a fine Development proposal to be submitted to major corporations.

Internal: Two Development collegiums on maneuvering and "failure syndrome" address the spirit struggle of the House.

Contradiction: Mopping up millions of maneuver mangling minutia. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Visiting colleagues uncover RS-1 grad who says, "If I had known who ICA was and its relationship to EI, I would have gone to the GWF."

Internal: House spends Week II on workshops that concretize plans for the rest of the quarter.

Contradiction: Weaving all arenas into one thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: First stake meeting is held with Global Slide Show. Colleagues attend Guardian Consult, two for the first time.

Internal: Interior doors are painted and fire exit installed, as first touch of snow arrives.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering quickly and effectively in midst of troop shifts and priority changes. (Wk. 5)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Alice maneuver team returns home triumphant. Week is spent evaluating and setting up next tri-micro saturation. House is invited to Riverside Civic Club (Houston neighborhood) to help plan their second Town Meeting.

Internal: Richard Kauffman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Stakes meet at community center, remaneuvering for the quarter. Voice continues with great success. Lot clearing continues and pipe and concrete are donated for street signs.

Internal: Alex St. Clair wins Future Farmers of America leadership speaker's award.

Contradiction: Acquiring leadership savvy of teamwork in securing success of upcoming events. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: CYF sponsored by St. Jude's Church in San Antonio has 70 participants who bridge the north and west sides of the city. Staff visits local FHA and MET directors, and attends Rural Health Initiative Seminar in Uvalde. Library has bakesale to raise money for electric bill. Stakes make plans for clean-up projects.

Internal: House extends gas lines to three more rooms in preparation for winter.

Contradiction: Doing maneuvers instead of tactics. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Oklahoma City maneuver set-up continues as two TMs, one Imaginal Education course, one RS-1 and two training events are set with dates. Other events are targeted. Three members of the Whitsett family are sent out to be consultants in Samoa.

Internal: Final repairs and renovation on new house are made as House prepares to move to new facility.

Contradiction: Establishing the critical Wayside Inn dynamic in the midst of ongoing maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: "The Bonnie and Clyde Intrusion" saturation maneuver does set-ups and hold-ups in 28 little towns with 11 events held, 15 to go including two CYFs. Second week concludes with celebration in Cleburne with local cadre. Evening at the Institute in Dallas has 30 colleagues, ranging from Austin Faith and Life days to new contacts.

Internal: House celebrates Mary's new job as Tribunal Administrator with the American Arbitration Association.

Contradiction: Practicalizing responsibility for total past of House and tri-metro while forging out a new future. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: First Town Meeting: Mississippi assembly is great event in Jackson. Last four TMs are set in first stronghold. CYF with 40 Catholic high school students is profound event with do-able proposals. Global Women's Forum is set for Governor's Mansion with 200 women targeted. Quarters II and III objectives for Project are planned on warboards by community leaders. Staff raises \$3500 for pre-school from Delta Foundation. TM office is set up on the 20th floor of a state government building.

Internal: Sector meeting is planned for Thanksgiving weekend in New Orleans.

Contradiction: Tightening plans in November and December so that winning new year strategy in Project completion and TM: Mississippi 200 is illuminated. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Council on Aging is discovered as network for set-up of TMs and/or other Community Forums across the State of Louisiana. GWF is set for February.

Internal: Outpost is established in Caritas convent near Covington for Bougalousa maneuver.

Contradiction: Discerning and actualizing radical new possibility in the midst of being faithful to the mundane of ongoing tasks. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Jackson, Mississippi stronghold moves into new orbit as \$25,000 is committed from Governor's office of volunteer services and as 12 TMs, one CYF and one Assembly are completed with six more TMs set and one GWF to be held in the Mississippi governor's mansion.

Internal: Permeator lands second part-time job as Transart Accessory designer and begins first part-time job as Girl Friday to key Guardian.

Contradiction: Developing quick methods and materials that allow people a way to talk about what TM is and why they would do one. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First two saturation events are held: a CYF of 95 and a Town Meeting with local song, story and symbol workshop leaders. Development arrives to spiritize first slide show and puts realistic meat on funding anxieties.

Internal: Bay window is painted after months of struggle to complete the job.

Contradiction: Discerning necessary victories and pulling together events that will polish off the *Carter Country Call Maneuver*. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: First experiment with saturation results in four events in Gibson HDP in five days with 75 adults and 160 children participating. Visiting impact team expands staff's imagination with global stories and reports.

Internal: Order Youth impact House with musical program in sodality.

Contradiction: Concretizing guild plans. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Calls to a Jewish synagogue in Miami inquire about Imaginal Education. Fourth Task Force on churchwide education uses maneuver methods in setting up tasks for the next quarter.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a fine event as prolegomena discussion draws a response of "they don't teach things like this in school, do they?" from one of the youth and conversation on creative tension informs and heals.

Contradiction: Turning the vulnerability of "working alone" from paralysis to purposeful action. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Development announces the acquiring of commitments for \$920,000 toward the million. The HDTs modules in Fifth City train 140 participants, including 71 Fifth citizens. Whole Nexus spruces up for one and a half day visit by USAID evaluators, who hope learnings are being written down, since ICA mode of operations is unique. North America HDTs brochure is designed and printed.

Internal: Bishop Mathews celebrates House Church, at which Debra Drown is received as intern.

Contradiction: Repositioning troops rapidly enough to handle shifting priorities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Much effort goes into set-up of HDTs training modules on housing and community welfare: 380 invitations are sent, 40 letters are written to mini-zone leadership and 10 panelists accept.

Internal: House participates in the elections: two as judges and some campaigning for friends of Fifth City.

Contradiction: Transiting from individuals' support for Fifth City to corporate or mass support for Fifth City. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Twenty-five people attend Christmas planning meeting and decide on four Friday evenings for major activities beginning with a festival December 1st. Development gets off to a good start with \$1350 in hand from two corporations and several key referrals.

Internal: Two celebrations in one week: ecclesiola and a Mexican dinner Saturday night provide refreshing discontinuity as mission intensifies.

Contradiction: Turning excitement with the quarter's maneuvers into regular engagement through Christmas. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Everyone gets off to Guardian Consult in Chicago. New Thursday night planning format introduces weekly maneuvering for the entire metro to enable the region.

Internal: House Church, shifted to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, the first of the quarter's experiments, seems to hold the transition to Week I in a new way.

Contradiction: Keeping the foundations (materials and logistics) firmly in place as a launching for strongholding. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development raises \$5000 in hand from week of shooting toward the million for the globe.

Internal: Area priorship visits and shares wisdom on saturation as well as reflecting on the future of the Order.

Contradiction: Tying together a practical day-to-day role besides the weekly planning and debriefing. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Saturation begins with Pleasant Hill TM. Three more TMs are set this week. Several more are up for Town Council decision.

Internal: All rooms are full as St. Louis' Wayside Inn houses five additional colleagues on election night eve.

Contradiction: Focusing the weaponry for maximum fire power. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Town Board approves welcome signs, preliminary proposals for economic development, space design and toy recycling.

Internal: Project celebrates receiving order for barnwood for oak flooring of Steve McQueen's cabin.

Contradiction: Creating readiness of local people for concrete community responsibility. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Regional economic task force meets with mayor, council members and Land Use Guild to report on research and funding possibilities. Canteen holds grand opening with 25 Kinney youth celebrating their summer's work.

Internal: Collegiums for quarter are set with five rationales for edge, study, HDP skills, methods and visibility, and 50 skeleton constructs are drawn up.

Contradiction: Clarifying purpose of EDA trek in order to tie all Project activities into one focus. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The first five TMs and one rural GWF are done and the next five are set up.

Internal: Development does long-range planning and engages metro colleagues, as House goes to the field.

Contradiction: Scheduling evaluation while constant doing is the demand. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The Area Chicago GWF faculty expands as women from nine cities and five Houses converge on Indianapolis for the Forum Friday and pedagogy Saturday morning. Great TM in Mentone is co-sponsored by Chamber of Commerce who pays \$100 local fee, Methodist Church and Town Board. House sends Marvyn Womack from Louisville cadre to last two weeks of Academy.

Internal: House celebrates mid-quarter victories with dinner at Napasaki Inn and moves on to pull together stronghold, host 20 women for GWF training and finish RS-1 recruiting.

Contradiction: Shifting the fascination of new contacts into the realm of decisions based on historical necessity. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Metro colleague, Bo Mohl, recruits friend to TM training, in kinds lodging for circuiters at friend's house and signs up friend for workshop leader.

Internal: Sarah and Libby from Louisville sojourn for one day, alphabetize newsletter mailing list of 1,000, see HDP slide show and ask when they can do more.

Contradiction: Finding a way to embrace an increasing number of tactics with the style of "Lord give me more." (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Region's first completed stronghold reaches over two percent of the population and yields ICA office, Guardians and two recruits to the Community Leadership Conference in Fifth City. Fifth stronghold is initiated and two GWFs are held for displaced homemakers.

Internal: Detroit stronghold task force studies *Way of All the Earth* and finds restatement of GWF talks.

Contradiction: Turning Development promises into gifts. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council is highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The Grand Street Guild Demonstration Forum, the Abingdon Square Community Forum in New York City, and the tri-micro maneuver session provide the momentum for carrying through the final weeks of tri-micro saturation in Quarter II.

Internal: The ecclesiola study prepares House for the reshaping of the symbolic and spirit life of the Order, in order to address itself to the world, whose symbol system has fallen in disrepair.

Contradiction: Breaking through new horizons in Development approaches. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Region sees first sign of new colleagues as new TM grads agree to help TM set-up in neighboring towns.

Internal: Area prior's visit enlightens the way to use maneuvering as generaling people rather than a tactical system.

Contradiction: Doing one saturation now with an eye focused beyond December. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Saturation of Seneca Lake area yields six firm dates and seven more strong possibilities which will require follow up. One Town Meeting is set up by phone in the midst of Halloween goblins interrupting both ends of the conversation.

Internal: "Immortals" leave House with Miraculous Million Maneuver and plan for the arrival of the area strike force team to do Day I Development calls in response to the Seneca Lakes meetings.

Contradiction: Assuring a multiple direction approach to recruitment which will assure the success of the Seneca Lake meetings. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes. Ten Development appointments take place with five more scheduled for next week. The Galbreaths attend the Guardian Consult in Chicago.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: New depth of engagement in the social programs of the Project is experienced as intensified focus takes place in economic development. Increased interchange activity is marked by three people going to Fifth City for training in EDA packaging. Six teams go out all day in Virginia on saturation visits.

Internal: Field maneuver collegium reveals new clarity on the present situation relative to the quarter's victory and results in practical mid-course correction tactics.

Contradiction: Using the newly acquired VISTA slots as an opportunity to recontext Project staff and tighten up daily systems of operation. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Spontaneous workday on school holiday nets two more rooms of preschool operational, just in time for preschool mothers' meeting.

Internal: Ecclesiola dances of awakening and engagement symbolize Project's engagement possibilities that have been developed in the past month.

Contradiction: Daring to take yet another step to put the bottom of the mountain in touch with the top to get the store in operation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Metro meeting moves to North Philadelphia for the first time as a sign of House's seriousness about raising up local leadership. Attendance quadruples, releasing new forces to participate in the planning of the *Evening at the Institute*, in the framing of CYF and in the events of the Harrisburg stronghold.

Internal: Asking Bananeiras consultant to host Week 11 celebration and de-briefing after day-on-the-turf in Harrisburg reveals new way to catalyze local participation in the stronghold.

Contradiction: Concretizing decision to win by building a logistical support base that includes reconfigured office space. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Bi-racial GWF in Morristown produces important network entrees, a firm date for the next GWF in Mountain Lake, and four eager new staff for moving on Newark—from Morristown!

Internal: Establishing the Hong Kong system for Development solidifies decision to do local (regional) Development, and prompts setting of 20 appointments so far for Week 7.

Contradiction: Breaking through new horizons in Development approaches. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Fact sheet distribution, stake visiting, and core meeting increase commitment following questions raised by newspaper articles.

Internal: Saturday's workday with six regional colleagues moves along firewood garnering, House winterization and move out of old dwelling.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of depth breakthrough and maintaining it by constant push on spirit. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Dates and facilities begin to shape up in Bridgeport. New Development brochure, designed by the House, is sent out through the efforts of three metro colleagues. Two others spend time on the phone.

Internal: House and Development team attend movie *The Big Fix* about the protest movement in the 60's and where they are now.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with accelerating demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Firewood industry research hits the road with marketing trip to Long Island. Saturday workday yields significant progress on the entrance sign and Project office renovation.

Internal: Inkind blitz yields great food surprises and House is gifted with colleague visits and participation.

Contradiction: Focusing the loose ends to victorious culminating events. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Stronghold Development visit discovers a community relations officer who can and does say yes to supporting two forums, and invites a LENS team to make a presentation for his company, all on the first visit.

Internal: House begins the week creating tactics, and ends by celebrating victories at a play called *Inherit the Wind* in which a colleague plays a key role.

Contradiction: Using advantage of dates set to enlist total stronghold participation. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Saturation funding is underway in the Gaspé of Quebec with \$200 gift from Roman Catholic Bishop to pay for one Community Forum.

Internal: Metro colleagues from Montreal Area move into forefront, providing leadership for ecclesiola and gifts of consolation for injured Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Seeing beyond the nitty gritty demands of translation, funding proposals and GCF set-up to next saturation stronghold. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Task force blitz, *Golden Horseshoe Strike*, creates a brochure and Development letter, and mails it to 200 companies in preparation for the raising of \$6000.

Internal: Area prior's visit brings the news of saturation and Development breakthroughs.

Contradiction: Getting the long-range plans and the short-range implementaries done when the four House members all have different hours. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Development and authorization have a "true and beautiful" week as 26 out of 26 visits produce all requested, and sometimes more.

Internal: Internal life celebrations come alive with poetry reading in Saturday evening ecclesiola and birthday celebration, and guest night on Thursday.

Contradiction: Formulating troops in the course of the set up and preparation going on now. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Everyone is engaged as four combine Guardian Consult with research/marketing trip covering two nations, nine states, three provinces and three time zones. Six cabinetmakers take two-day trip to provincial furniture factories. Adult education center opens with two classrooms and a library.

Internal: The phoenix arises with the securing of a new three-bedroom furnished mobile home for nine months in kind and the birth of Dara Elise Stringham, seven and one half pounds, October 10th.

Contradiction: Getting immediate funds for programs which need short-term funding before winter comes, in the midst of long-term funding plan. (Wk. 6)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Several visits by government agencies produce breakthroughs in the arenas of housing, parasite and mosquito control, and facilities construction.

Internal: War room is transformed with new area names, Latin American grid over map and cleaning blitz.

Contradiction: Building focus and eventfulness into weekly design. (Wk. 7)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: The printed documents are received! Preschool expands with new staff and students and three classrooms. Project moves into accelerated phase of adult education with classes in tractor mechanics, guitar, and a new phase of sewing classes which includes the beginning of the sewing industry.

Internal: New auxiliary member, Julio Lopez, is welcomed.

Contradiction: Finding way to weave established leadership with young rising leadership into effective core. (Wk. 8)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Special forces arrive to vaccinate villagers against tuberculosis. Bakeries are visited in Silva Jardim and Rio Bonito as lard is donated for community bakery. The lettuce crop is selling well; tomatoes in two weeks. Major Development breakthrough happens as request for philanthropic status in Brasil is pushed through. Major donor agrees to provide services as an umbrella agency to Bananeiras contributions.

Internal: Workday creates village demonstration garden at House, capped off with Irish celebration.

Contradiction: Finding the gimmick that will move the community beyond one-by-one participation to raise up a core of community leadership. (Wk. 6)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: A week of visitors is highlighted by a visit from Bishop Herbert Edmundson and members of the Anglican Church Army who are incredulous to discover that this is only the second quarter of the first year of the Project.

Internal: Jim Stovall is sent out with *dupe* (ghost) stories ringing in his ears after conducting four CYFs and setting up 23 more with Anglican and Catholic youth groups.

Contradiction: Putting self-conscious structure on the guilds. (Wk. 7)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: After an exciting Week 4 in which the community bakery opened and the first demonstration irrigation project was installed in Conacaste, interest accelerates with the beginning of first local industry. One of three trainees in wicker making returns to begin local manufacture and the response is fantastic, working almost dawn to dusk with several new adults joining the work during the week. Donation of a typewriter enables writing of thank-you letters and more requests. A second pump offers possibility of another irrigation demonstration.

Internal: *Mesa Rodonda* (Round Table) and collegium become a regular part of the auxiliary's life, allowing all to catch up rapidly on the collective wisdom of the global Movement.

Contradiction: Developing funds for and/or inking transportation to enable full use of advantages given by victories to date. (Wk. 8)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports victories toward the miraculous million continue with two individual commitments for \$160,000 and \$30,000, Reynolds Tobacco \$103,600 (for January), and HUD \$15,000. Cross-centrum coordination empowers corporate thrust of Nexus. Global Development discovers a new willingness of people to hear our story. The key contradiction lies in the arena of developing a system of tracking monies which adequately envelopes all of the complexities.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the HDTs at Sudtonggan finishes first week with 60 participants from 12 nations across SEAPAC. The Global Movement Academy visits the four Centurms in Chicago and expresses fascination with what keeps the Movement ticking. First HDTs Week II module is held in Fifth City with 140 present from Fifth City, Uptown and four regions to deal with housing and welfare. The breakthrough comes in the applicability of the HDTs format to the urban situation and the amazing corporateness and creative tension between confident, qualified local man and eager, humble outside experts. The key contradiction lies in the arena of passing beyond immediate tasks and paralysis to be the responsible remnant in the unknown cloud of becoming.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Clancy Mann returns from India in time to do New York LENS for staff of Fund for Multinational Management Education. Two-day AID visit engages GSD post in dialogue on methods of evaluation and practical support systems. Uptown holds CYF and a ward TM, anticipating another four. Plains, Georgia has a fine TM. Work on Houston Pivot City maneuver welds resources of Development and Operations in the field and lays groundwork for effective programmatic framing. The key contradiction lies in the arena of Centrum field maneuvers in discerning contradictions which inform creation of common operational models and roles.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports coordinated effort between Chicago and Brussels enables grant auditing, legal issues and HDP accounting for Brussels Nexus. Hong Kong submits global funds first quarter report and Institute reports for June and July. Chicago closes October report, prints HDTs brochure, TAB and ACT manuals for India. Space transformation continues with new communications node in the switchboard area. Corporate responsibility for the functioning of the whole Centrum is practically grounded in weekly maneuvers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of global interchange dynamic having practical form and deadlines.
