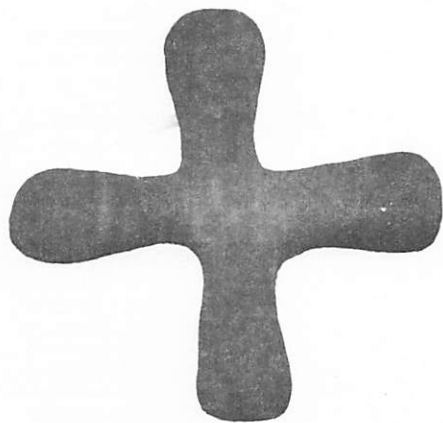

WEEK ONE

OCTOBER 2—8, 1978



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Visit with local councillor, John Brannagan, produces appointment with Inner London Education Authority to offer CYF to London schools plus EEC authorization. National Westminster Bank sends \$400 donation. Harrison & Crossfield offers needed inkind materials for powerhouse. Area Council, joined by regional colleagues, builds quarter maneuvers.

Internal: House sends out Bernard Rees to India, Kim Bigwood to Academy and Louise Albright to one week Fellowship of Reconciliation Conference at Iona community.

Contradiction: Running the race without clarity on whether it is a marathon, a mile or a 100-yard dash. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Area Council in Manchester kicks off the year in grand style, giving new wisdom on TM campaign. Networks of town councils and community education say yes to TM series in Glasgow region.

Internal: Colleague joins House for ecclesiola of songs, look at *Weight of Victory* paper, and helps with new House decor for collegium room.

Contradiction: Making use of extraordinary forces to maximize maneuver possibilities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Completion of Adventure Playground marks the end of the rapid visibility phase, and community building negotiations herald the establishment of a solid economic sign.

Internal: The tribe attempts to settle in, as the lounge becomes international with 15 Germans, one Belgian, two English, and two French.

Contradiction: Focusing momentum while moving without having a plan to run with. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meetings are held in Lancashire and North Yorkshire, with one set up for Staffordshire, while group of clergymen in Gateshead consider Town Meeting format in September.

There are too many people with you for me to put Midian into their power; Israel might claim the credit for themselves at my expense: they might say, "My own land has rescued me." Therefore, make this proclamation now to the people: "Let anyone who is frightened or fearful go home!"

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diane Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Development contributions this week include a 200 franc (\$46) gift from *Vivre Montaudin* Association (a group created out of a GCF). Addressograph-Multigraph: France delivers a 1250 press with 1000 free GCF workbooks.

Internal: The week of space recreation and tribal resettlement is culminated in time for a grand Area House Church.

Contradiction: Initiating the quarter's maneuvers while preoccupied with past campaign debts and post-summer campaign momentum. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Persistent cousin of newest worker in wood industry gets insurance forms filled out, goes over crop document, and calls mayor to approve rent for abandoned preschool for industry while auxiliary staff shadows him.

Internal: Four leave for Continental Council and nine, including two Italian colleagues, return after incredible event.

Contradiction: Catalyzing twice as much with half as many. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: ITI: Jos graduates 48 new participants from 11 states in Nigeria. Within the week, new grads begin visiting Ijede. Two requests for impact programs are received.

Internal: House reunites at closing feast of ITI.

Contradiction: Meshing new area excitement and Project polishing into one focus. (Wk. 12)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus sends out Barbara Williams on LENS trek and Charles Hahn to Africa and NAME.

Internal: Great ecclesiola centers on Africa, with food, conversation and rehearsal of history.

Contradiction: Making sure that the Guardians are handled amidst the many other tasks. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House puts together list of advisors to Town Meeting program amidst great affirmation from those invited. First date is set in targeted saturation micros.

Internal: New brochure and new workbooks to the printer signal new quarter.

Contradiction: Unlocking the door to multiple set-up while not being blocked by not having the key. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Colleagues re-engage in Global Community Forum campaign by setting and keeping appointments.

Internal: "Demon Demolition Maneuver" transforms House space into the land of the New Reality.

Contradiction: Using advantage of colleagues' social demonstration vision to release engagement from CF maneuvers in the Netherlands. (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two workshop leader training sessions are held in Mulheim-Sud and Vogelstang. Manfred and Hanneri Golda and Blase Sands prepare to assume responsibility for Frankfurt metro colleagues. Elizabeth and Manfred attend vatolikentag (church conference) in Freiburg to staff joint CLC (Jesuit) and ICA booth on volunteer groups' participation in HDPs.

Internal: With everyone home for a brief time and the children in school, House has PSU on Town Meeting workshop leader training.

Contradiction: Allowing the Quarter II plan to be built comprehensively rather than as a reaction to the awareness that the communities' calendars are presently in charge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The community's imagination is captured by planning for upcoming Christmas market. The community newspaper, *The Laterne*, is produced and distributed, mainly by community youth. Community secures its own loan to finance Community Center rent. Cafe Zur Laterne passes finance office check with flying colors. Week is culminated in Area Council.

Internal: Area Council celebration grounds the fact that late-night celebration can provide momentum to get the following day going!

Contradiction: Carving out a new direction that people can say yes to. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: U.S. Embassy and Kapini HDP sign for primary school grant of 15,000 USD. Foundation is dug in a morning by 200 residents and footing laid as building materials roll in on sub-contracted truck. Farm trainees work dawn to dusk putting in new irrigation system at demonstration farm and plant vegetables. President's Citizenship College faculty, responsible for rural development training, visit KHDP for a day to study how to engage local people in the task of development. New circular guild hall of poles and grass goes up, and tents disappear. Five pig trainees return from commercial farm with live pig ready to go. Village Forum team is sent out to do Chipata polises.

Internal: Mrs. Margaret Mutambo, Institute trustee, stays night at Project and arranges for weekly sewing instructor for women in Kapini.

Contradiction: Finishing the new guild hall before the quarterly Assembly. (Wk. 1)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Egyptians preparing for global assignments raise \$430 in travel funds.

Internal: House holds a send-out party and makes an early airport trip for Amal, on her way to Delta Pace by way of Academy.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum while setting up authorization for village acceleration. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: The first of three combis arrive from Colgate Palmolive for KHDP. One of original ten farmers, Raphael Njoroge, secures manager's job in rural area of Kenya. Rose, a two-year veteran of Kawangware Youth Corps (KYC), returns to Kawangware to do field training with KYC following seven-month training in government school for directors of Harambee Nursery Schools. Eleven goats arrive at Nairobi Airport and are transported to the nearly completed poultry house at DUF. Staff visit with Abadallah, director general of Muslim Council, results in offer of support in arenas of finances and authorization for Muslim Village in coastal province.

Internal: Hawa and Alberto Rosario and their three children join auxiliary in preparation for new Project at coast.

Contradiction: Grasping the depth of life in Kenya and releasing the long-term power of the Kenyan for the world. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Health Guild and Preschool parents meet and decide to jointly build a Demonstration Community Kitchen for the preschool feeding program. A lease is signed for land for Block Industry. First low-cost demonstration house site is selected. Immediate government funding and authorization are promised in abundance for dam building and social programs.

Internal: House welcomes Joseph Mwangangi, a community leader, for a month's sojourn in the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: Pushing the completion of dams, road and house roof before the rains. (Wk. 12)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Training contradiction is attacked with three-day Project directors' module, one-day support force training and PSU to build new form of Consult.

Internal: House celebrates the christening celebration of Michelle Balm.

Contradiction: Creating intensive and flexible models on the thin ice of authorization and communication. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Old contacts introduce us to major industrialists and to a member of Parliament for village funding and authorization. GWF is set for September 9th with over 40 participants already registered.

Internal: Study of Erich Fromm's *Art of Loving* impacts House and colleagues at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Demonstrating hope in midst of city fearful of kidnapping and floods. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenks spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: A two-day Development PSU launches a \$12,000 strike force. House sends out staff for Bubun Consult.

Internal: House welcomes the Wrights, Rebstocks and Thorntons.

Contradiction: Sorting out internal life and self-support while everyone's on the move. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Several proposals approved, including a first—a six-week tourist attraction for Nepalese personnel.

Internal: House welcomes Jaime Vergara, John Cock, and L. The and sends Kathleen Rees to Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Speeding up the implementation of new assignments. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Nine village leaders meet after three months of inactivity to assess current status and explore ways of quickly moving toward Project completion. Village head man affirms ICA presence and gives personal support.

Internal: Michael family arrives to give new insights and thrust to the mission.

Contradiction: Focusing the indirect village approach toward consensus and implementation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Egg production from first chicken house increases to 146 per day. The second and third houses are established and

two more are planned. Manager of Charoen Popkhand Chicken Feed Company promises to donate 200 chickens, feed and medicine for both Bontoa and Bubun HDPs. Villagers cooperate with film crew to prepare a TV documentary on Kelapa Dua for TV Republic of Indonesia. One hundred fifty attend Friday night guild meeting to see global slide show.

Internal: Guests include Leo Stockley on his way to Bontoa and Ellen Rebstock from Singapore Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Catalyzing new village participation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village survey is completed as the last of 157 houses is visited. Four village leaders participate in the kabupaten (district) pre-Consult briefing and Minister of Home Affairs signs approval to do the HDP.

Internal: House returns to a normal timeline as a kitchen is established in the facility.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on different village factions and discerning who is the real leadership in the village. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: New found Guardian, Mr. Chris Dagg, INCO, visits village, commits four consultants, used office equipment, beds, engineering assistance and funding. Drainage ditch workday engages village youth and Emerging Generation.

Internal: Auxiliary moves into the oldest house in Bontoa.

Contradiction: Developing the finesse and clout to graciously bypass bureaucratic corners. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development work continues in the midst of Hong Kong and Tokyo Area Council. American Express announces US\$2,000 grant for Nam Wai.

Internal: Nexus hosts the Hong Kong Area Council as Lee Ferguson and the Larry Greenwald family depart for new assignments.

Contradiction: Laying the track for the year ahead of the new directions that the Area Councils will demand. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The youth make a new decision to care for the whole community and combine with community girls into a formally structured group. They immediately take charge of the social programs and organize a sports day, an outing around Hong Kong, and repaint the village school, demonstrating their seriousness to all. Finance manager of large bank visits Project with architect Guardian in preparation for loans to Nam Wai Foundation. Many visits are made to various factories to find an alternative product for the village factory and ensure a profit.

Internal: Two full-time permeation jobs at International School and another part-time at the Chinese University, open up many possibilities for GSF.

Contradiction: Creating ways for movemental Guardians to participate in the Area Council dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Five villagers, the pre-school teacher, and two county officials depart for Sudtonggan (the first trip out of the country for all but one).

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Singer commits \$5,000 for 1979 expansion. Development receives \$6,000 in-hand Week 9.

Internal: House sends out Judy Albers and Russ Wheelock to North American assignments.

Contradiction: Grasping the real challenge of this year while experiencing the do-ability of our assigned task. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Translation of Senator Charles Percy's Fifth City speech in June and the Global Priorities is underway. House writes maneuvers in preparation for Quarter II Council in Area Hong Kong.

Internal: Macombers celebrate 11th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Synchronizing external and internal operations into one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Decision of four families (seven adults and 16 children) to intern at Langub HDP is announced at guild meeting. Village plans *despidida* (farewell party) for the night preceding departure. Road workday of whitewashing rocks proceeds in midst of torrents of rain. Three nights of quarterly planning generate excitement over new proposals in each guild. Twenty-three rock cutters and wives take field trip to see the luxury houses and shopping center made of Sudtonggan rock.

Internal: Rebecca Cabute from Langub and Teresa Marshall, Liz Barkony and Cindy Booher from Chicago arrive in time to celebrate the year's first House Church.

Contradiction: Falling back into old patterns when radically new patterns are called for in this third year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: House plans with 15 community leaders, deciding four priorities to focus this next quarter. Staff attends the burial of ten-year-old boy.

Internal: Jaime Vergara visits Langub and notes the changes since the Consult in January.

Contradiction: Broadening the structure of the community leadership with few ICA staff. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Area Council is held in Sanya Community, launching great new year when Japan and Korea will become gold in every prefecture.

Internal: Preparation for Council results in magnificent decor and a celebration joined by eight local colleagues.

Contradiction: Empowering Council maneuvers in the midst of the temptation to take all quarter to prepare. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG II HDP

External: Village treasury receives a 700,000 won deposit from Kwangyung primary school after two villagers were sent to Japan to develop money for the village. The Korean community in Japan donates money to the Kwangyung villages—Kwangyung II, Kwangyung E, and Kwangyung Som. Village leaders celebrate a good harvest by holding a community picnic in the high pasture. Preschool attendance jumps from 23 to 32 after summer vacation time. Village trading post is leased to a Kwangyung II family and shows signs of new life.

Internal: House studies many other HDP Project documents to excite the global image of Kwangyung II.

Contradiction: Catalyzing more village responsibility for the HDP (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Yu Young Jim and Yung Sok Ho, village leaders, spend Saturday morning in workshop with auxiliary, evaluating sub-tactical actualization of first four months. Task force of two young men makes 3,000 concrete blocks for new village buildings.

Internal: House entertains Lee Jae Joon and Lee Song Ja, Jeju Project priors.

Contradiction: Catalyzing corporate village care. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Two women from House journey to Haha to do three meetings in three days with a little help from colleagues there. The trip culminates in a small CYF, a *Chiiki Kon Dankai* (Town Meeting), and an HRM, all led by Japanese.

Internal: House builds maneuvers in relation to Area Council preparation.

Contradiction: Creating a practical plan for volunteers and staff to allow full participation in breakloose of TM in Quarter II. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: House sends out Regional Council invitations. Region begins planning group for GWF and receives LENS brochure.

Internal: Emerging Generation experience living in Japanese homes as staff travels to Tokyo for Area Council.

Contradiction: Getting off the drawing board and into the orbit of action. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Oyubari Summer Program '78 concludes with the 2nd Annual Logging Festival, followed by a campfire and folk dance in the evening. More than 120 people from seven different nations come to Oyubari during August to participate in the practical training dynamic through working with Oyubari residents. House enables the funeral of a community resident with transportation and bedding.

Internal: House takes a few days of discontinuity and ends the week with a House RS1 in Tomakomai city to prepare for the quarter ahead.

Contradiction: Articulating the Summer Program's significance for the future and avoiding the trap of reduced stories. (Wk. 12)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Visit with leading company director secures promise of introductions to major companies in Sydney for Development push.

Internal: House hosts Development PSU team as it sets the maneuvers for each region for the coming month.

Contradiction: Finding the new sociological form of engagement of Those Who Care. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: A fine demonstration CMA is held with East Fremantle Town Council. A visit with senior officers and minister for Community Welfare and Aboriginal Affairs Department reveals new sobriety in government relationship to OHDP.

Internal: House hosts colleague Pauline Chia at Saturday Night Guest Night and celebrates Joan Priest's 21st birthday.

Contradiction: Using the week's tactics for CMA State Assembly to leapfrog into the future. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lbs. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of their own responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Regional workshop results in 30 people assigned to task forces for implementing the Year of Australia, following a fine Area Council.

Internal: Whole House participates in Area Council and returns to celebrate Brown's arrival and the presence of John Burbidge enroute from India to Perth with a sumptuous Indian meal.

Contradiction: Meshing regional task forces in maneuvers that push the whole mission forward for the Year of Australia. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Zonta (international women's service organization) speaking engagement may open new avenues for business expertise and Development prospects. Sir Roger Darvall is revisited and seems open to enable Sydney networks.

Internal: House hosts Murrin Bridge team and Ronda Saegenschnitter during Development push.

Contradiction: Establishing a clear picture of victory in Development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House visits with Canadian ambassador who gives a C.I.D.A. book to assist proposals for Apia Consult and referrals to New Zealand C.I.D.A. funding. A key visit with Sir Gustav Nossal, one of the world's leading immunologists, places ICA in new orbit of advocates for funding. Thirty-three at a PSU on finances and Development for area write maneuvers to deal with present financial crunch and prepare new ways for cash to flow.

Internal: House sends out Marge Tomlinson and Wanda Holcombe to Indonesia, George to Brisbane, Whites to Sydney and receives Bronwyn Rees from Termini.

Contradiction: Doing all the authorization required all at once instead of serially. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Initial calls to old colleagues, businessmen and politicians shake up our own consciousness and the care of the people of Brisbane when they are presented with the possibility of an HDP in a rural town in Queensland.

Internal: A robbery, the late arrival of the August House check, and intense planning for the Queensland push better our awareness of the need to create new corporate structures.

Contradiction: Allowing the power of the HDP story and the power of our Brisbane contacts to mesh and move out together. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Guardians from Sydney and Melbourne bring ink-ind goods and help paint two more houses. Monday leaders' meetings over lunch are launched. Youth stage celebrative concert and dance and visitors include head of Aboriginal Section of New South Wales Health Commission.

Internal: Troops return from Satellite PSU to write coming quarter's maneuvers.

Contradiction: Enabling the community to own the structures that corporatize Project momentum. (Wk. 13)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: House begins the Pacifica Awakening Campaign by sending Bill and Mariana Bailey on the tri-region circuit through Port Moresby (Papua-New Guinea), Suva (Fiji), and Auckland (New Zealand) by way of Apia for the Consult.

Internal: House completes planning for the year with decor creation and a celebration of the ten years of the Religious House.

Contradiction: Particularizing care for colleagues from the metro in the tasks for the next year. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Four more site selection visits help in prioritizing sites and focusing the selection screen.

Internal: Collegium focused on manuals and maneuver writing elicits excitement and eagerness to engage in external task.

Contradiction: Leaping into the task when clarity and transportation are elusive. (Wk. 1)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Team hits the road for first saturation maneuver of the quarter. One mayor from a 1977 TM says he will talk to 15 other mayors to set up TMs.

Internal: Office file reordering creates beginning of rationality in the midst of the chaos of files from three Houses.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the week's priorities so that nothing stands in the way of saturation maneuver. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: First Richgrove Fair nets \$700 for Community Center Park and baseball diamond. Rabies clinic vaccinates 88 dogs. Third newsletter distributed. CETA framing and proposal writing opens more government doors in Tulare County.

Internal: House hosts guests from Cusick and Mill Shoals Consults, Nam Wai HDP, sojourners and Development team.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of neighborhood participation as guilds "cover the waterfront" in several directions. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Forty-five community people surprise Basil Sharp on his birthday. Day Care Guild puts on rummage sale and makes \$115 to go to the day care center.

Contradiction: Engaging Phase I in the community. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Maneuver Maniacs, Rug Crunchers and Barnstormers pitted against each other in fierce competition during indoor olympics to celebrate Regional Council planning victories: writing quarter maneuvers, choice of saturation sites, timeline and movemental designs.

Internal: Two high school girls arrive increasing House number by two thirds and spinning initial image of CYFs.

Contradiction: Finding a working base for the breakloose in donor development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Campaign Night engages metro colleagues in Regional Council planning and preparation. VISTA proposal for Richgrove moves one step nearer to approval. House participates in California planning and workday at Richgrove, releasing creativity for saturation breakthrough.

Internal: Recreation of corporate space nears completion as freshly painted walls lure new decor.

Contradiction: Finishing space transformation so that full energy is released for saturation. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Outhouses are painted by village children in preparation for the Consult.

Internal: Mission priest leads House on tour around the district, pointing out plants, wild burros and remote villages, some of which have been recently abandoned.

Contradiction: Containing anxieties about Consult logistics so they do not detract from eliciting community engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: First Regional Council in three years (first ever held in Cannonball) births a three-week awakening maneuver model.

Internal: The spirit event of the House trek is a baseball game between Billings and Cannonball.

Contradiction: Releasing colleague engagement in midst of separation of local concern and global priorities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Small Animal Husbandry Component goes local and moves to Stake 4 with John Thunderhawk family taking over the Cannon Ball Rabbitry. Day Care teachers write curriculum to implement stakes through Day Care structures.

Internal: Everyone moves in tribal resettlement which concludes with a progressive room-warming celebration, including gift of 50 pounds of apples.

Contradiction: Contexting events and tasks in order to instill a sense of satisfaction and pride in vocation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: House sets up five saturation maneuvers in four days.

Internal: House celebrates three victories: inkind, self-support and House care.

Contradiction: Creating the systems that will engage people and supply the back-up for regional maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: First development circuit of the year helps with Northwest Territories maneuver prep with signal gift of plane tickets worth \$900. Surprise of the week is job applicant who comes to dinner.

Internal: Neats sent out to Vancouver, R. Robins secures student visa, R. Woodbury lands job and both youth pick up team priorship roles.

Contradiction: Facing the unknown of the Northwest Territories and the necessity of rapidly surfacing regional troops. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: House gets ready for Development week with 20 appointments. Intensive maneuver planning through the week prepares House to launch Williams Lake District saturation on Monday of Week 13.

Internal: Art Rowe gets an interim job and driver's license during inkind week topped with inkind Pizza Hut pizza.

Contradiction: Risking and moving ahead in the midst of ambiguity about saturation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Site selection team returns and, after intensive reflection on potential sites, travels to Kodiak to look at two more villages. Team returns again to confirm the decision to approach an interior native village.

Internal: House celebrates with a moose and buffalo feast on the return of the site selection team and a round robin, three-stage birthday celebration for Eileen Howard.

Contradiction: Releasing auxiliary to enable colleague participation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Week of meeting Saskatoon and Price Albert colleagues yields Development funds and a sense of re-engaging Those Who Care.

Internal: Summer paper on framing excites and informs all about local directions.

Contradiction: Creating events which enable colleagues to build a practical vision which elicits their own engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Proposal for purchase of the Community Store by local couple is submitted to ARDA. Auxiliary spends long weekend in Edmonton at Area Council. Vogar leadership development continues as Vogar Products operates on their own for two weeks. Vogar resident spends two days in Winnipeg researching Vogar Woodworks.

Internal: Religious House demonstration moves onward as linoleum is laid in collegium room, new lounge is created, and guest and auxiliary rooms are all refurbished.

Contradiction: Focusing limited troops on necessary village tasks while positioning the rest for new program year with councils and maneuver planning. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Two Project mayors, nine participants from three HDPs, and 35 colleagues impact Area Council at Texas Southern University.

Internal: All priors participating in Area Council planning experience awe and wonder at gridding and budgets.

Contradiction: Maintaining balance during shift in emphasis from areas and counties to regions and micros and pulling together pivotal city, saturation and Development into one thrust. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: First community Congress is held with 30 people present. Presentations are made to Snyder Rotary Club and Linwood UMC in Oklahoma City. Playground presentation is made at guild meeting by Bob Chetham, Oklahoma City's Director of parks and Events, a home town boy.

Internal: Two House members visit Comanche County Memorial Hospital for stitches.

Contradiction: Focusing involvement so that Health Fair becomes project of local residents. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Project sends in all materials to complete step two of sewage plan. Fifty people attend health seminar on diabetes and high blood pressure. Project receives letter of intent for mop and broom factory. Alice's Tri-micro Maneuver sets 15 event dates in four days. Stakes receive assignments for Assembly preparation.

Internal: House begins new time design to allow most time in actuation.

Contradiction: Involving people in sustaining the structures that have been created. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: The Ponca City maneuver begins rolling in a big way with initial town visits, feedback on easy set-up for TM, GCF and GWF in tri-micro towns. Two-thirds of the food is inkinded and lodging is secured.

Internal: Guardians close deal on old Religious House facility and House receives keys for the new facility.

Contradiction: Forging the new role of the Regional House and the off-field general. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

Contradiction: Enabling Prepare for Tomorrow group to include whole community. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Colleagues gather for celebrative evening in new house with new area priors and staff. The decision is made to support Town Meeting and slip in an R51 in New Orleans sector.

Internal: Dorothy Baines arrives to complete the staff

Contradiction: Feeling out strongholds while making the House totally ready to enter Quarter II. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Decision is made to do the first Mississippi Planning Development District with final O.K. on funds. Country ham is inkinded for meeting next Week II in Pace. First Shelby County Host Committee meeting is held.

Internal: A reception for area priors, Tim and Kay Lush, brings all colleagues up to date.

Contradiction: Securing a solid base of self-support in the midst of forging ahead. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: House creates a brochure for saturation maneuver, renovates county and inkind files and sets in motion a model for strengthening the Guardian net.

Internal: Area priors visit and share maneuvering strategies from other regions.

Contradiction: Hitting the road with a well-prepared saturation maneuver while establishing primal sustenance foundations. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Stake walks, open house and many conversations regarding Academy and Guardian Consult participation catalyze a new sense of collegiality in Gibson. The finest work day yet, with a multiplicity of activities—raffle ticket and T-shirt sales, flea-market, hot-dog sales, space clean-up and depot

painting—create a swirl of activity around the newly acquired depot.

Internal: House hosts area priors Tim and Kay Lush, who make their first visit to North Carolina and the Gibson HDP.

Contradiction: Involving the community in webbing the awakening and demonstration campaigns in the midst of unclarity regarding saturation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: An Evening at the institute held at the church draws 45 and much supportive response. A Town Meeting-style planning event generates deep awareness among leaders of the congregation and paves the way for more such events in the future.

Internal: Visit by Tim and Kay Lush revives a faded vision of how all House members can share the full missional intent.

Contradiction: Creating authentic consensus on the vision of the mission. (Wk. 13)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: More than 100 registrations come in for 15th Guardian Consult. A visit is made to Fifth City to consider the HDTs site. The HDTs faculty manual is completed. Verdell Trice of Fifth City visits Nexus to train Development on how to win a \$500,000 proposal. Faculty are sent to Jamesville for a LENS with CAP agencies and to Indianapolis for GWF.

Internal: Two back-to-back collegiums push to corporate stew on paravocation.

Contradiction: Caring for the symbolic in the midst of overwhelming centrum tasks. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Area Council hosted with 125 in attendance, 12 hours and four projects represented. Auxiliary meeting with 40 people reviews summer accomplishments and Global Priorities, and sets Council date. Youth Employment and Training program for 40 youth is completed with reflection, trip to amusement park and supervisors' lunch.

Internal: Fresh paint, new decor and redecorated cafe are lasting benefits to house of pre-council preparations by assembled priors.

Contradiction: Handling multiple financial structures of Area, House and many programs which block implementation maneuvers. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: The Annual Lions Club Watermelon Day Festival on Saturday marks the end of Phase II of the Project. Highlights include stake floats and the largest parade ever, a local history museum, all day flea market, games, rides, and tree watermelon, volleyball and horseshoe tournaments, Lorimor T-shirts made on site, a two-hour visit from Congressman Tom Harbin, and at least 25 movement colleagues who visited for the day. Attendance was between one and two thousand!

Internal: Arrival of the Murphy family brings a tornado of activity to the House.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of the thrust of Phase III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

Internal: Ecclesiola with 30 present includes guests from Brazil (Sharon Turner), Cannonball, and Bangkok.

Contradiction: Producing plans for action at a Region Council which is to be nonchalant. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Iron Range demonstrates the power of resolve and corporateness as two meetings are held simultaneously. Community leadership gathers to discuss the plans to create a scrap wood fuel industry. The host committee, comprised of ten towns on the Iron Range, creates the plans for the world's first Iron Range towns assembly.

Internal: With two regional troops in Maharashtra for the month, ecclesiola on replication hits the spot for the 24 present.

Contradiction: Directing opportunities with intentionality and unity while being wooed by and wanting to go chasing after every single breakloose. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: House creates newsletter and mailing list for region.

Internal: Dolores Morrill visits St. Louis and spins on maneuvering with House and colleagues.

Contradiction: Building field maneuvers that put House on death ground. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Work Saturday continues into the week, resulting in approximately five acres cleared for park and picnic area. Global framing team works with auxiliary and local residents to produce nine proposals for economic development.

Internal: Nancy Knowlton is welcomed on her way to Memphis assignment.

Contradiction: Keeping sensitive to the pulse of the community, both to avoid pitfalls and to take advantage of opportunities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: First economic breakthrough of Kinney HDP happens as 20 people gather to hear regional economic advisory group spin on funding possibilities, potential industry, and housing, and spark a lively discussion on moving the town. Internal: Regional Council celebrates a week of inking, including ongoing bread and produce sources, and \$130 worth of theatre tickets to Moliere's *The Imaginary Invalid*.

Contradiction: Creating the training designs that release agency staff to do strongholds and enable the ICA to be the catalytic shadow. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: All four categories of formation, interchange, awakening and demonstration swirl as all towns and addresses are readied for first stronghold in the northwest. PSU during Week II creates the first UPDATE of the year for TM participants. The first 12 are lined up for Mill Shoals work day, September 30th, and count nears 30 for first GWF on September 26.

Internal: House holds surprise wedding anniversary celebration for Bengels, complete with skits and impersonations.

External: Council participants meet to rehearse maneuver building methodology in preparation for Guild's Quarter II maneuver workshop. Town Meeting campaign receives check in mail from Sears, Detroit group, for \$300 and readies cars for circuits.

Internal: House completes necessary construction on in-kind facility and symbolizes the year's new game with in-kind seats at Lions' pre-season opening football game.

Contradiction: Naming the immediate victory that claims the new year for the entire region. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: The New York City tri-micro saturation team finds itself meeting on the turf with the set-up of five appointments for five events in the tri-micro. Area New York strike force meeting in New York breaks through with Development and TM set-up workshops.

Internal: The Order Life Manual for Quarter II is printed and distributed.

Contradiction: Leaping from the sidelines of meeting into the action of setting up Town Meetings. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: A visit with a colleague at State Department of Community Affairs brings possibility of impact courses and permeation.

Internal: Ecclesiola study of Bonhoeffer's paper illuminates dichotomy of presence of Kingdom of God.

Contradiction: Releasing our imagination to create the models which claim space and task. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional meeting in Niskayuna pushes troops out into the turf.

Internal: Phoning blitzes into post-TM towns seed geography for Week II foray.

Contradiction: Accelerating the external mission without a clear understanding of new models needed. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: The entire House participates in Prior's Council while new sojourner holds down the homefront.

Internal: House members return from Global Prior's Council and Phase I camp, and one permeator receives \$100 per week raise.

Internal: School starts for the Youth Cluster with high excitement and no study halls.

External: Lucilee and Richard Chagnon family is created in a great Saturday wedding bringing together family and many regional colleagues.

Internal: Allentown and Philadelphia colleagues meet, sharpening up metro grids and demonstrating a new decision to take full responsibility for the region as a whole.

Contradiction: Actuating the entire region while concentrating on the first three strongholds. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK
External: Regional colleagues hold on-the-turf meetings, and decide to pick up responsibility for Patterson tri-micro saturation.

Internal: Thursday night riotus celebration absolves and appropriates Quarter I as *Superflaw*, dead and resurrected.

Contradiction: Using extended reconnaissance instead of engaging the enemy on the battlefield. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP
External: ICA serves as consultant for Regional Small Farms Conference for the northeastern United States held in Poland Springs, Maine. Stronghold saturation hits the road with key authorization and funding calls. Starks Woodshop set-up proceeds rapidly with the miracle of a first order offered by company for pallets.

Internal: Auxiliary moves to new location, farmhouse on Chicken Street, with heat!

Contradiction: Beginning a new phase of Project actuation with unclarity about relationships between facilitating structures. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD
External: Regional planning meeting in Portland, Maine is the key event of the week as 12 strongholds are selected and put on a timeline. The meeting also includes local representation from Starks, Maine.

Internal: Decor-making clarifies our vision of the year by transforming concepts into visible reality.

Contradiction: Wrestling the temptation to do only the part of the year's plan that is most enjoyable or least difficult. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP
External: Project meeting celebrates the arrival of the Consult documents.

Internal: The Spirit Movement sings to the world in the Staten Island Ferry terminal.

Contradiction: Broadening the maneuver ground beyond the core of active supporters. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON
External: Revelations of Week I and II stronghold foray show the power and significance of framing. First \$50 is donated toward stronghold during Thursday Campaign Night.

Internal: House uses new slide show for visiting outreach commission and is gifted during presentation with Paul Clements' witness on experience in India. House sends Nancy Trask to India with help of \$200 from regional colleague.

Contradiction: Developing materials packet which authenticates story of past success of impact events for local communities. (Wk. 1)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL
External: Ten parents attend workshop training session in the executive suite of the city's largest school in preparation for the 60 school committee workshops (forums) to be done this fall. Final preparation tactics for New Day Canada include sending out two more to Lorne.

Internal: House receives unexpected Wayside Inn gift in the mail from summer cyclist with reflective note on the impact of House lifestyle on his life.

Contradiction: Determining the radical sign that will deal with the financial reality. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO
External: Development snatches \$2400 unexpectedly from old colleagues. House expedites legal transfer of Lorne Acadien Heritage Homestead.

Internal: House shines like a new shoe as colleagues come out of the woodwork for first House Church in new facility.

Contradiction: Relating the initial regional maneuver to the gifts of present colleagues. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA
External: Meeting in Alexandria of the planning commission for rural areas of Glengarry County considers a series of 15 Issues Forums for their towns. House does speaking engagements with the Ottawa Kiwanis Club at the Chateau Laurier and the Businessmen's Conference on National issues in Montreal.

Internal: Parish Hall (auxiliary house) in Lorne burns, leaving auxiliary in care of the community.

Contradiction: Trusting interest created by last year's awakenment events to catalyze saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP
External: During the week following the burning of the parish hall, community participates anew with over 110 present at meeting with Catholic Bishop for future plans and transformation of mobile home as new community space and base of operation. *Voice* is published in basement of Barry Hickey's home, the original site of the first issue.

Internal: Auxiliary receives gifts of clothing, food and lodging from the community and boxes of blue clothes from Chicago.

Contradiction: Avoiding the liberal trap of the "the real objectives have been accomplished and the details don't matter." (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP
External: Area Council of over 40 sees old and new colleagues excited over the maneuvers for the coming year and plans for caravans across Venezuela and the polishing of Cano Negro. Preschool moves to temporary quarters so that the general store can become the node on the village square.

Internal: House celebrates two birthdays, the send-out of Rafael Davila to Maryknoll delegation, Marilyn Swims to be married, and Nelly Gutierrez to work.

Contradiction: Coordinating one thrust which will invite participation of Cano Negro leaders as well as all colleagues in Area Caracas (Wk. 1)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Wicker classes receives first local requests for products—20 tomato harvesting baskets. The community sees that outside help is not always necessary as members mobilize to enable sick boy to receive medical attention. Village donates space in home for one month intensive sewing course taught by the Institute of Rural Education. Day care is set up to enable women's eight-hour participation six days a week.

Internal: Guild core reflects on journey of Project as it selects persons for Brazilian Interchange.

Contradiction: Locating additional program space and equipment to allow multiple programming and celebrations. (Wk. 1)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Fazendero's tractor plows the demonstration farm plot. Lettuce is planted, with tomatoes to follow. The Bananeiras preschool, resplendant in uniforms sewn by village mothers, marches in the Independence Day Parade (September 9) in Silva Jardim. The Women's Group has begun meeting regularly. External: Document takes on new intensity as Health Outpost treats 60 patients in first week. Stake IV builds a mini-park. New preschool building is lined out. Jamaica Development Bank representatives come for site visit. "Trinamic Trio" joins Jean Forbes in Kingston to break open ground for two GWFs in October. Visits to businesswomen, diplomat's wives, church and social leadership produce yeses.

Internal: House celebrates Lingafelter's tenth wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Living the broader vision that lends meaning and urgency to week-by-week maneuvering. (Wk. 13)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

Paris and London Houses call Brussels Nexus to report contributions in hand. Maharashtra Project directors and U.S. House priors participate in Development circuits. The key contradiction lies in the arena of cash in hand.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Singapore Nexus sends the Bishops to research mythology and transparency methods in Aboriginal mythology and hears Jim's report on Eighth HDTs in Maliwada. Bombay Week II task force creates replication circuit consultation model to launch four new Projects as an experiment in launching new projects. Chicago experiences exhilaration of fresh work on paravocation, the retreat and Economic Issues Forum (EIF). Breakthroughs happened in activating the band, with ways to involve the total Order in researching the totality of Order live and mission. The key contradiction lies in the arena of deciding to act in the face of ambiguities and complexities to create the relevant interchange mechanisms for the present year.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports HDP launchings with 20 consult teams assigned and trained in Maharashtra, the first Consult team totally assigned from South Seapac goes to Bubun and Bontoa in Indonesia, and Consult team leaves for Pisinemo, Arizona. Brussels completes and activates a tri-continental tracking board. Support and interchange systems are underway across the Band. The key contradiction lies in the arena of moving on all fronts in the face of demanding immediacies.

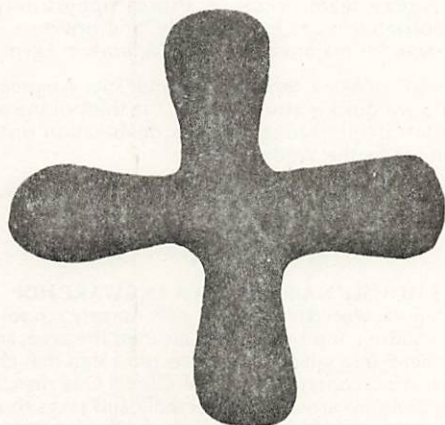
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Hong Kong gets to work on AID: Jeju accountability and Brussels treks to Africa. Chicago inkind is in Wisconsin lining up a year's supply of paper. The trend is in using budgets as a missional tool in Singapore with Projects and Houses, in Bombay with all HDP sites, in Brussels with Africa and NAME, and in Chicago with the Global Centurms. The key contradiction lies in the arena of keeping current with all systems in all countires while pushing on the new models necessary for long-range victory.

Internal: House puts crucial collegium decor in place in time for Week II study of the four RS-1 theologians.

Contradiction: Moving with the momentum of the present advantages without being overwhelmed by the practices. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Thirty-six large market, restaurant or seaside umbrellas leave for Atlanta, Georgia store. Community struggles with decision to sign request for derelict building for industry and necessary sign.

Internal: New decor sparks Rome's ICA office.

Contradiction: Finding the structures and images that sustain the community's decision to move into the future. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Town Meetings in all five stakes culminating in a community assembly on Saturday triples the guild membership and brings new urgency for cooperation among the stakes.

Internal: House sends out troops on a three-region circuit to visit recent ITI grads and participates in the ordination of Tony Amoako-Atta.

Contradiction: Building a workable weekly rhythm that shifts community interest into engagement. (Wk. 4)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Calls with two colleagues illuminate necessary steps to secure resident status for ICA in Belgium and work permits for all staff.

Internal: House enjoys new mood created by first ecclesiola of the quarter.

Contradiction: finding the right key to turn to open doors to residency and work permits. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Setting five dates and training workshop leaders breaks loose first networks in saturation stronghold.

Internal: House hosts Wedge team and Mrs. Bedell on way to India.

Contradiction: Creating the tools and stories that allow rapid maneuvering in the field. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: *Markwaldtag*—full day Town Meeting near Frankfurt—is fantastic happening with over 200 present and local workshop leaders bubbling with their accomplishment.

Internal: Vogelstang steering committee visits House for dinner and contributes their ideas about formulation strategy for this quarter.

Contradiction: Meshing advantages from the past with the one-in-every-polis strategy while keeping the first priority—formulation—always in front. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Community workday clears alleyway in preparation for moving printshop to Community Center, sets up graphics room, and puts up fence railing in the park. House sends Gabi to Brussels Guardians meeting, and receives 2000 DM from BEWAG. A great new style of discipline is exhibited in Wednesday Guild meeting on the other side of the community planning maneuvers.

Internal: New format and style enable ecclesiola to be a great spirit happening.

Contradiction: Meshing House area maneuvers with community planning maneuvers into a coordinated maneuver plan for the Project. (Wk. 4)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: The second quarterly assembly is kicked off with colorful drumbeat march of all task forces in uniform to ribbon-cutting ceremonies at the primary school foundation, new maize mill, staff training center, general store, and huge, circular grass-roofed Guild Hall. Six guilds plan and present 30 victories for Quarter II. Following pre-school teachers' graduation, the Iron Man award, and Assembly consensus on guild leaders, the goats and pigs, pit-roasted by the farm trainees are delivered to the five stake dining areas for a plenty-for-all 300 feast. Drumbeats call all to dance with barrels of refreshing mukoyo drink made by the women. Meanwhile,

the second monthly allowances are paid to 55 daily task force workers from maize mill and store income.

Internal: Week I collegium breakfasts draw over 50 each morning as maneuver methods are worked through in preparation for weekend planning.

Contradiction: Finding ways to undergird new community-wide engagement in the stake-a-day building of the primary school. (Wk. 4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Wedge team presence affords opportunity for major authorization visits in the public and private sectors which set stage for major support of ICA work in Egypt.

Internal: New auxiliary arrivals Tim and Sue Wegner and Nurul Fazria are quickly absorbed into the thick of the social demonstration battle through serious deliberation on HDP completion led by the Wedge team.

Contradiction: Finding ways to work with the local government bureaucracy. (Wk. 4)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: A great workday is held at new nursery school with parents of children and others who cleaned the area, set up play equipment, dug sand box and erected a sign that clearly states that this is a community school. Global Guardian, John Clark from London, arrives unexpectedly and takes tours of both Kawangware and Kamweleni Human Development Projects. Following quarterly planning session, community leaders are entertained by a magician who has a position at university but sees himself caring more directly for local man through his skill as magician.

Internal: House shares an exciting week with Charles Hahn and Ray Spencer bringing two Houses together for a fine session on the future out of the present situation and determining what is required for this year.

Contradiction: Looking at the practical "hows" behind all-consuming vision. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Kamweleni is energized by community meeting led by community leader Mzee Ndolo and a moving speech by blind elder Mzee Kalai. A massive step is made in framing as a high-powered community delegation visits five top level government officials in one day, and District Commissioner assures full support. KHDP is invited to serve on two district-wide planning committees to determine spending of 200 million shillings. District Commissioner gives nod to Village Meetings in every village in the Machakos Integrated Development Project—200 villages. Kamweleni HDP is selected as a demonstration health program for the Machakos Integrated Development Project area, and a commitment is made for a resident Clinical Officer, paramedic with advanced training, to staff community dispensary. Government commits staff and medications for an immediate interim weekly clinic in the Health Outpost and a community-wide malaria suppression campaign.

Internal: House sings for six hours all the Other World, Love and Pop/Folk songs, in a marathon troop revival.

Contradiction: Enabling every auxiliary to stand on death ground. (Wk. 4)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Training contradiction is attacked with three-day Project directors' module, one-day support force training and PSU to build new form of Consult.

Internal: House celebrates the christening celebration of Michelle Balm.

Contradiction: Creating intensive and flexible models on the thin ice of authorization and communication. (Wk. 1)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: This week lays the groundwork for launching the buffer projects. The cities of Modinagar and Gaziabad are visited. Potential villages, sponsoring companies and authorization are located. Development receives a request from a UN agency for a proposal to do a project in Bihar (Calcutta Area) and receives letter from the Indian Government supporting the ICA.

Internal: Personnel, decor and spirit are all strengthened by the arrival of Jon and Maureen Jenkins for sojourn enroute to Sri Lanka, and John Patterson and Vinod Parekh working on Development and authorization.

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for an IJ having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Old colleagues are tapped for assistance in Nexus self-support maneuvers.

Internal: House sends out Phyllis Mielke to Bubun and Bontoa Consults, and welcomes visitors, Wegners and Jill Eglund.

Contradiction: Bringing corporate stew to decision and moving on it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Several visas are approved, including a first—a six-week tourist visa for Nexus personnel.

Internal: House welcomes Jaime Vergara, and John Cock, and sends out Kathleen Rees to Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Speeding up the implementation of new assignments. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Project has begun to accelerate with work days for irrigation ditch cleanup. Ground is leveled for a new industrial complex to be built by MARA. Landrover is received and promptly traded for a mini-lori to be used for the local pasar (market).

Internal: Project personnel interchange begins with the arrival of Alim from Serusup.

Contradiction: Dealing with the desire to have all things in hand before moving ahead. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Egg production from first chicken house increases to 146 per day. The second and third houses are established and two more are planned. Manager of Charoen Popkhand Chicken Feed Company promises to donate 200 chickens, feed and medicine for both Bontoa and Bubun HDPs. Villagers cooperate with film crew to prepare a TV documentary on Kelapa Dua for TV Republic of Indonesia. One hundred fifty attend Friday night guild meeting to see global slide show.

Internal: Guests include Len Hockley on his way to Bontoa and Ellen Rebstock from Singapore Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Catalyzing new village participation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village survey is completed as the last of 157 houses is visited. Four village leaders participate in the kabupaten (district) pre-Consult briefing and Minister of Home Affairs signs approval to do the HDP.

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Nexus sends out Tony Elizondo to preparatory phase of HDTs in Sudtonggan as Area Hong Kong gears up for next step forward in strategic Project Expansion.

Internal: Ecclesiola study intrigues the Nexus with "familiar ring" of author's poetry and therefore elicits participation in the quarter study.

Contradiction: Moving beyond the immediacies of getting started to building the sustaining momentum for the quarter. (Wk. 4)

Internal: Global priorities are carefully interpreted and translated by metro colleagues for House decor.

Contradiction: Waiting for year-long TM campaign to come clear while an opening exists through government agency to move on half the counties this fall. Framing (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The third semi-annual Guardian meeting creates plans for launching national Town Meetings. The GWF task force meets to set first GWF date for the year. House prior makes a trek to two provinces and sets up one TM with two more possibilities.

Internal: The House hosts the Town Meeting Task Force and a House Church with seven guests.

Contradiction: Doing the priorities in the midst of the many things that need to be done. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Village leadership core come to the Training Center to receive the Bells and to discuss major issues. Preschool makes a progress report as Holt Foundation makes site visit. Preschool clinic is reinstated after summer and new students are enrolled.

Internal: House reaches full size as Park Si Won and La Roche family arrive from Area Council.

Contradiction: Creating more visibility while being blocked by building permits. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House attends Area Council in Tokyo. Miss Kawasaki, who just helped in Natta, goes to Area Council with House.

Internal: House finds that getting all of the children cared for is a task in itself.

Contradiction: Contexting the guild to build the big picture and broaden motivity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A week of building communications with colleagues nets ten Guardian visits, newsletter written and translated, and completion of the Regional Council report.

Internal: Oki Gomi (garbage day) nets 20,000 yen (105 USD) for Development in solid goods.

Contradiction: Moving on critical tasks with decisive action. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: The new quarter is implemented with six staff covering four posts that will enable doing the Project, Development and authorization, impact courses and Town Meetings in every prefecture in the region.

Internal: New time design enables House to accomplish mission task and self-support.

Contradiction: Refining good ideas down to practical tactics. (Wk. 4)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Visit to national office of Lions International opens possibility of CMA support. Week II PSUs set up designs for quarter's Guardian involvement and new meshing of external and internal mission.

Internal: House hosts Bill Newkirk en route to Jakarta forestry conference, and colleagues from Melbourne, Murrin Bridge, Canberra and Brisbane.

Contradiction: Rebuilding momentum and establishing other beachheads. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Letter to Minister for Community Welfare commends joint government decision to assume responsibility for the continued development of Oombulgurri and succeeds in getting the minister to correct erroneous press statements about excession expenditure. The presence of Bill Newkirk opens up a new network—timber/forestry—when it is discovered that top local businessman staff had unsuccessfully been trying to see will be at the same international convention as Bill in Jakarta.

Internal: House hosts eight guests: five Oombulgurri leaders, two area troops and the Newkirks' mum.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Fortnight maneuvers are written with the help of old regional colleague who commits himself to practical enablement of satellite support and CTC.

Internal: First ecclesiola for the quarter uncovers hidden theatrical talents in two Phase I women and old Phase II couple.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the hill that needs to be taken, knowing there will be many hills to take in between. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House sends out Holcombe and Banks to Brisbane for authorization calls for new Project possibilities in Queensland, and for Development. Development circuit in Canberra reveals new donors and expands professional base. Doors begin to open for Catholic orders funding HDPs.

Internal: Dinner for metro colleagues who have all worked on HDPs reveals one Development circuiter, one GRA participant, one ready for another HDP assignment for one year, and one possible intern.

Contradiction: Keeping on the road with major authorization calls whilst immediate needs always seem to be cash in hand. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Unilateral support from public sector is received and \$10,000 proposals are requested by private sector for rural HDP.

Internal: With the acquisition of two full-time jobs and one paid training job; House has reached the point of full engagement and is gaining effectively.

Contradiction: Obtaining front-end funding to get on the road with HDP site selection. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: First quarter ends with games day celebration of the first six months of MBHDP. New quarter begins with wide and enthusiastic participation in rabbit and kangaroo hunts. Research and demonstration of tanning as a potential industry is begun.

Internal: Auxiliary enjoys visiting task force of Melbourne colleagues during a long holiday week-end while painting exterior of house and beautifying yard space.

Contradiction: Giving form to a community-initiated 13-week plan. (Wk. 4)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Local leadership is unexpectedly in place for the launching of the showplace this week with quarter maneuvering, the first guild meeting, and the first stake meetings.

Internal: House is refreshingly caught up in new construct for the quarter in ecclesiola and collegium.

Contradiction: Spinning structures of the community into creating practical daily tactics out of maneuvers. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: With four weeks to go to Consult, Prime Minister says "go do a village," and high chief of Salani suggests "Salani will be a model for Western Samoa."

Internal: Everyone auditions for role of poetry reader at ecclesiola which comes as a breath of fresh air amidst ambiguity of the task.

Contradiction: Practically grounding the village yes without getting trapped in *Messiah* image. (Wk. 4)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Fresno saturation team holds one training event and

sets 12 TM dates, while Sanger colleagues, the Duers, inked paper and printing for 600 workbooks.

Internal: Following spontaneous Friday night at the movies, Fresno team returns for weekend of planning and rethinking of maneuver strategy.

Contradiction: Creating the power lines that maintain the input and output flow. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Regional Health Department backs the new expanded water system 100%. CETA approves \$59,000 grant of seven positions, subject to Congressional approval. Two Town Meetings are held; three more are set up plus two special events. Two community meetings, community leaders' breakfast and businessmen's lunch reinforce community involvement. The adobe brick industry gets affirmation from C.U. research group.

Internal: House sends out Noemi Castillo and Margaret Ennis to Pace preschool training weekend and Paula Laiewski and Reuben Enriquez to the Pisinemo Consult.

Contradiction: Intentionalizing the stake dynamic in the midst of implementing the total tactics. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Cusick is on-stage with award from three county Panorama Land as the community "showing exemplary courage and insight in meeting the difficult challenges of nourishing the life-enriching values of the American small town."

Internal: Auxiliary out on self-support and saturation leads to Religious House being used solely by community to do necessary tasks.

Contradiction: Creating model for internal systems and other Project issues to support economic development (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Tri-cities saturation maneuver is wrapped up after 11 TMs and a rally.

Internal: House claims space, finishes moving out past residents, and order chaos in the midst of ongoing events.

Contradiction: Building strongholds that include quickly setting up urban groups. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: House and colleagues claim two more metros for saturation. Regional office, framing in San Bernardino, and comprehensiveness screen push task forces to move on first urban metro.

Internal: Week II House planning event emerges with new image of strongholds, the year's phasing plan and corporateness intensified.

Contradiction: Releasing time and focusing energies on the particular phase of the battle we are in. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Outhouses are painted by village children in preparation for the Consult.

Internal: Mission priest leads House on tour around the district, pointing out plants, wild burros and remote villages, some of which have been recently abandoned.

Contradiction: Containing anxieties about Consult logistics so they do not detract from eliciting community engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Glendive Maneuver creates swirl of contacts: re: guardianship, networks and additional strongholds, while setting up four Town Meetings for next week.

Internal: House launches quarter with a week of hashing through the maneuvers and tactics, working with the Southside community task force and celebrating of Sharon Rafos' birthday.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of present advantage in local communities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Project office moves from old auxiliary house up into shopping center. Old house is now available to elementary school teachers who want to move into the community.

Internal: Full auxiliary is on site as Pat Despain arrives this week to bring stories from Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Enabling the community to create new images of responsible care for their families and the community. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Seven people from Denver region attend Fifteenth Guardian Consult. Two thousand workbooks are inked just in time for first saturation maneuver Town Meetings.

Internal: Global Construction Guild (self-support organization) gets T-shirt bearing world grid and first checks bearing name of the company.

Contradiction: Bringing off saturation while other critical tasks are lagging behind. (Wk. 4)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: McKenzie Valley saturation maneuver reports Inuvik CYF of 150 grade 10, 11, 12 students and CFC of 15 at Tuktoyaktuk on the Arctic Ocean.

Internal: House plans and prepares for Thanksgiving feast in midst of rethinking maneuvers and anticipating the Thomsons' arrival.

Contradiction: Discerning next steps in region without knowing when next saturation maneuvers will be launched. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Williams Lake saturation maneuver is going strong with four CFCs, one GWF, one CYF and Assembly location set.

Internal: Area prior and movement colleagues move House while maneuver is going on 350 miles to the North.

Contradiction: Orchestrating House systems, colleague care and metro circuits with engagement in the Three Campaigns. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Week's trek to Fairbanks/Minto nets solid yes for HDP go by December from Minto Native Council as well as solid yes of support and authorization from all agencies serving the Alaska Interior in which the Minto HDP site is located. Work in Anchorage nets decision of regional colleague, Vogar participant, to gun regional enablement for the HDP Consult.

Internal: Ecclesiola involves colleague guests and House in

passionate dialogue with Dunne's *Way of All the Earth* prologue and musicale extravaganza with champagne bottle tooters, wine glass glockenspiel, flute, mandolin, saxophone, and the woeful singing of a 65-year-old dog named Spot.

Contradiction: Moving on priority tasks in the midst of inertia related to overwhelming possibility of HDP Alaska. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Ongoing Development, saturation planning and self-support push make a full week.

Internal: Second part-time job and offer of sales job come in.

Contradiction: Creating working decor that informs practical next steps. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Vogar Construction Co., Ltd. starts construction of their second house as the Hall gets a new foundation and cemetery is brushed out. A visit to Dauphin Metro Regional Development Corporation official opens up possibilities for saturation.

Internal: Peter Njoroge gets a 30-day extension on his visa and a huge 23-lb. turkey helps House celebrate Thanksgiving for everything.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering effectively in the midst of immediate demands and dispersed troops. (Wk. 4)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Alice maneuver team returns home triumphant. Week is spent evaluating and setting up next tri-micro saturation. House is invited to Riverside Civic Club (Houston neighborhood) to help plan their second Town Meeting. Metro circuits are initiated with Week II trip to Austin.

Internal: Richard Kauffman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Guild meeting builds Quarter II maneuvers integrating workdays and celebrational events in order to touch the lives of the whole community. House ventures to Dallas House for a regional get-together for impact training with an Indianhoma community representative. Tom Gordon, Water Superintendent, and Rhonda Sims, City Clerk, leave for Pisinemo Consult.

Internal: Rob and Mary Work visit Project on way to new assignment in Dallas.

Contradiction: Exemplifying the team dynamic while moving on all fronts. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Town Assembly does planning for next quarter using documents printed by San Antonio chancery. Preschool building is painted and sign mounted by work team from San Antonio Methodist and two Catholic churches. Houston Brownie troop sends 400 library books and preschool supplies. Metro Cadre meets in San Antonio to plan next maneuver.

Internal: House welcomes Jay, Jose and Alan back for one week in between Town Meeting maneuvers.

Contradiction: Raising up effective leaders. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: The Ponca City maneuver begins rolling in a big way with initial town visits, feedback on easy set-up for TM, GCF and GWF in tri-micro towns. Two-thirds of the food is inked and lodging is secured.

Internal: Guardians close deal on old Religious House facility and House receives keys for the new facility.

Contradiction: Forging the new role of the Regional House and the off-field general. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: The Dallas Cadre and House "ride the range" in Johnson County visiting 12 towns to set up the *Bonnie and Clyde Saturation Maneuver*. Dane and Glenda Adkinson attend the Guardian Consult in Chicago.

Internal: The first ecclesiola of the quarter occasions awe and delight.

Contradiction: Orchestrating a saturation maneuver to claim victory from the situation, not require it from the troops. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: VISTA proposal is submitted for six Pace residents. PFT (Prepare for Tomorrow) group decides to hold work day Saturday. Community women plan second annual carnival. State Senator, Con Maloney, moves state authorization another level. TM team in Jackson inkind six weeks' lodging.

Internal: House participates in fast in historic fashion: sundown to sundown.

Contradiction: Enabling Prepare for Tomorrow group to include whole community. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Two Town Meetings are held with Houma Indians in Montequet and Golden Meadow.

Internal: House finishes undercoat on two sides of Religious House as self-support tactic.

Contradiction: Learning to be experts quickly while climaxing Houma Maneuver and breaking inertia in relation to Bouglasa Maneuver. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Decision is made to do the first Mississippi Planning Development District without final O.K. on funds. Country ham is inkind for meeting held Week II in Pace. First Shelby County Host Committee meeting is held.

Internal: A reception for area priors, Tim and Kay Lush, brings all colleagues up to date.

Contradiction: Securing a solid base of self-support in the midst of forging ahead. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: The *Carter Country Call Maneuver* is in full swing with one TM and two CYFs set, one for over 1,000, opening for at least five other events, and inkind housing, meals, and office secured. Citywide CYF with Boys Club (one per club) plans move down the road.

Internal: House sends Zan White to Guardian Consult.

Contradiction: Breaking through necessary DAY I logistics to support both maneuvers while getting established in new jobs. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—BINSON HDP

External: Charlotte House hails victorious end of Quarter I and Phase II of Project with the securing of early learning facility at Methodist Church and the building of new locally-purchased and inkind equipment at the new Horizons Park. An ice cream celebration, reflection on workdays and send out of Viola Binfield to Global Academy follows with six regional colleagues joining in the festivities.

Internal: Three-day VISTA training in Columbia, South Carolina, deeply addresses House members with inadequate leadership training for full-time community volunteers.

Contradiction: Reconstructing fragmented community images of Quarter II, Phase III. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: A phone call from a Jewish synagogue in Miami inquires about Imaginal Education. Fourth Task Force on churchwide education uses maneuver methods in setting up tasks for the next quarter.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a fine event as prolegomena discussion draws a response of "they don't teach things like this in school, do they?" from one of the youth and conversation on creative tension informs and heals.

Contradiction: Turning the vulnerability of "working alone" from paralysis to purposeful action. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: LENS held at Sears International export division elicits comment, "We've accomplished nine weeks of planning in one weekend!" Development celebrates the week's deposit of \$104,000. Ecclesiola study books are distributed, and a Week II module continues refinement of the retreat construct. Phase I gets a new job at the amphitheater, cleaning up after the Barnum and Bailey circus.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a great happening with the study of preface to *The Way of All the Earth* and a musicale ranging from classical piano to West Virginia "hambone."

Contradiction: Maintaining tension between openness to all demands and single-minded use of time and troops. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Saturation plan for Fifth City gets underway with first siake forum set up. Community Center, utilizing new rent system, achieves first month of breakeven costs/income. Industry Center begins month with four new tenant businesses.

Internal: fifty page Internal Life Manual, written and published in two days, adds a good resource for newcomers to the House.

Contradiction: Starting the mass involvement campaigns without waiting 'til the gang's all here. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: First Community Assembly is held with 40 in attendance to decide the victories and major accomplishments for Phase III of the Project. Thirty-five community people become survey interviewers and complete in over 300 out of 375 households an all-community survey, using the Pace model.

Internal: Three people attend Regional Council in Kansas City, a signal happening with 35 people and all metros represented.

Contradiction: Deepening community commitment to responsibility for the next phase of the Project, rather than one event at a time. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Everyone gets off to Guardian Consult in Chicago. New Thursday night planning format introduces weekly maneuvering for the entire metro to enable the region.

Internal: House Church, shifted to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, the first of the quarter's experiments, seems to hold the transition to Week I in a new way.

Contradiction: Keeping the foundations (materials and logistics) firmly in place as a launching for strongholding. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Iron Range Stronghold draws to a close with an assembly of all the towns, held in Kinney, Minnesota. The decision is made that it would be a good idea for those who care in the Iron Range to meet regularly.

Internal: Twenty or more migrate to the Guardian Consult in Chicago, some by plane and others in the special blue van rented for the occasion.

Contradiction: Sowing the early seeds of every stronghold while keeping the momentum of each. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Thirty mayors are contacted and ten clusters are named and phased for year of saturation.

Internal: House grounds regionalis in study collegium, new office decor, and common collegium rationale for colleagues in Mill Shoals and Columbia.

Contradiction: Creating necessary local materials to rehearse story of saturation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Elders luncheon with 35 present is a moving experience as elders recite poems from their past. Project receives concrete pledge of assistance in helping to open print shop.

Internal: The first week of the new quarter is highlighted by visit of Lymans and Enrights and celebration of Addie Lyman's birthday with fabulous ship dinner.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum as completion of major projects nears. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Two days of inkinding in Minneapolis reaps harvest of linoleum for House; tile for youth canteen, shower stall; toilet; dryer; and a truckload of food. Regional work weekend rips old tin siding and concrete from auxiliary house and begins re-siding. All work stops on Saturday night for Kinney's first *Evening with the Institute*, hosting 30, including a county commissioner and a state representative.

Internal: Week II readings from *Trinity* enable reflection and conversation on the life of a revolutionary.

Contradiction: Prioritizing and timelining all outdoor work before winter hits. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: House hosts Wednesday businessmen's luncheon with slide show on HDP. Ecclesiola begins the quarter's care/engagement dynamic with colleagues.

Internal: *You can inkind anything* is dramatized by ten minutes of effort producing a 1' x 2' birthday cake and ten tickets to *The Big Fix*.

Contradiction: Moving from six wars to one war on six fronts. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Delegation of 13 represent bi-metro at Guardian Consult and return home with new images of effective Guardian participation. Global slide show at House's neighborhood association cements local authorization for ICA and bombards visiting political candidates with the power of local, corporate action.

Internal: Evening study of self-support collegium from the summer rehearses the revolutionary principles and the tension of doing self-support.

Contradiction: Adjusting rapid set-up model to allow towns time needed to secure \$100 fee. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Annual bi-metro Guardian event turns into decision for Guardians to meet monthly for training, engagement and celebration.

Internal: Metro colleague decides to engage in the mission by taking on sojourn relationship with House.

Contradiction: Creating death ground in the day to day tactics. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Upper Peninsula, Detroit, Bay City, and Hillsdale strongholds are in motion. Global Women's Forum recruitment workshops are held in Lansing and Escanaba.

Internal: Sauna celebration is held in Upper Peninsula to mark first week of stronghold set-up.

Contradiction: Sustaining new Town Meeting colleagues in their communities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Saturday meeting sees the welding of the region into a team with a common focus.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a happening as new common construct is initiated.

Contradiction: Sharpening and broadening maneuver thrust by intensifying the times of corporate meetings. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Key visits in Armstrong County catalyze creation of Armstrong County Saturation Maneuver, building on a clear advantage.

Internal: Sheer discontinuity is wrought by ecclesiola sodality, *Jabberwocky*.

Contradiction: Catalyzing maximum participation in a group of interested county leaders. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Region gathers in Binghamton to modify timelines and build funding plans for Seneca Lake Maneuvers.

Internal: Experiment with Day II timeline including later meals and ecclesiola at 8 p.m. allows more effective use of evening.

Contradiction: Creating new images of TM set-up while discovering the traps of old images. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Authorization and entrees are secured in the Hanover tri-micro through contacts and visits by the area strike force, opening doors to scheduling the saturation events. A CYF is scheduled for the Hanover Learning Center.

Internal: Area prior spins with House on generalship and maneuvering, sparking conversation and continued brooding on prowess in designing and controlling the revolution.

Contradiction: Recovering from "tactical thinking amnesia" in order to effectively use time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Three campaigns swirl as community congress plans next six months for Ivy City, regional field generals meet to work through saturation strategies, and banquet involving Those Who Care in the community and in the metro claims promises for the new quarter.

Internal: House reorganizes time design to include daily 9:30 P.M. reflection and new troop assignments to meet demands of new quarter.

Contradiction: Daring to envision the events of the week in order to break through propensities of last-minute planning and minimal participation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Widen's float is a shining example of local creativity in county-wide parade. Kids from all stakes join in the fun.

Internal: Bob Howard starts to work and Pat Howard and Elaine Stover set out for preschool training in Pace HDP.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with necessary maneuvers while taking time to elicit decisions to participate from both the community and the region. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: A two hour maneuver building session with Philadelphia metro colleagues lays solid groundwork for next two quarters, preparing for Philadelphia's saturation events and building a Quarter II timeline to significantly increase participation now.

Internal: Strike force insistence that not only quality is key, but also the tools to produce that quality, releases preparation for a quality Quarter III.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the set-up miracles needed to release local colleagues to be the field generals. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Regional meeting solidifies team and one thrust in tri-micro saturation. Urban lab collegium, centered on global indicatives screen, flashes direction for urban work.

Internal: Troop assessment collegium sharpens generalship.

Contradiction: Sharpening and broadening the maneuver thrust by intensifying meeting times. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: ICA serves as consultant for Regional Small Farms Conference for the northeastern United States held in Poland Springs, Maine. Stronghold saturation hits the road with key authorization and funding calls. Starks Woodshop set-up proceeds rapidly with the miracle of a first order offered by company for pallets.

Internal: Auxiliary moves to new location, farmhouse on Chicken Street, with heat!

Contradiction: Beginning a new phase of Project actuation with unclarity about relationships between facilitating structures. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Dates and facilities begin to shape up in Bridgeport. New Development brochure, designed by the House, is sent out through the efforts of three metro colleagues. Two others spend time on the phone.

Internal: House and Development team attend movie *The Big Fix* about the protest movement in the 60's and where they are now.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with accelerating demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Visits to set up economic PSU, both inside and outside the community, give different perspective on community and reveal a readiness to move.

Internal: Electrical system and gray water drainage system create signs of permanence

Contradiction: Soliciting a new depth of engagement in the community. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Midweek foray wins entree in last stronghold city.

Internal: Study of JWM Community Forum paper at end of fast puts stronghold work in new perspective.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of stronghold set-up while carefully getting nod of key economic and political networks. (Wk. 4)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: First-school committee forum is held with 91 participants. Sixteen parents volunteer to be on the committee. New Day Canada is attended by Those Who Care from area. Economic Community Forum, Global Women's Forum, Community Youth Forum and cabaret release saturation possibilities. Two groups are secured as sponsors with tasks for Global Women's Forum in Montreal.

Internal: House shifts 22 people from Montreal to Campbellton, 500 miles, with hourly changes in transportation models, for New Day Canada saturation event.

Contradiction: Creating the demand for saturation through creating the market, calling the troops, and targeting the locations. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: The quarter's biregional maneuver, *Seven Rising Towers*, begins with contexting of colleagues, and collegiums on the first saturation miracle in rural Ontario.

Internal: First ecclesiola of the quarter starts with an air of expectancy and refreshments, as old colleagues come by for a work day and Vogar marketing team is sent out to Fifth City, Chicago.

Contradiction: Getting whole House and colleagues on top of exact saturation victory target with no continuity from previous year. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Saturation site is located in North Leeds with 17 villages and seven townships, in conjunction with St. Lawrence College. The Miraculous Million begins to accelerate with Development Centrum present.

Internal: Inkind systems are in place and 10 plates of glass are in kind.

Contradiction: Stabilizing internal and external support systems to unblock mission expansion. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: One hundred-fifty people come to New Day Canada Assembly and report that the visit to Lorne is a highlight. CYF, GWF and ECF are held simultaneously on Saturday, with a fantastic cabaret that night. Regional battleplanning on Sunday seals the weekend. Valuable networks now are on board, setting the stage for saturation.

Internal: Trinity UMC of Brookfield, Wisconsin, donates a stove, washer, stereo, TV, bedding, furniture, dishes and clothes.

Contradiction: Building practical context and spiritized structures which immediately engage reconfiguring troops. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: The vows, ceremony and wedding celebration of Marilyn Swims and Jose Quintana impact community with their decision to be a bi-cultural, global family residing in Cano Negro. Workday in Caracas transforms office space for effective use in Development and GCF campaigns.

Internal: Arrival of Mercy and Kaki Njeguru, Ann Howie and Toni Mueller gives boost to auxiliary size and spirit.

Contradiction: Planning Quarter II before Quarter II arrives. starting. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Chilean Independence Holiday is celebrated with historical drama by the Youth Club, morning Mass in the soccer field, marching and parade by children's club, Ninos del Sol and preschoolers, and children's games and treats sponsored by the soccer team. Commercial Guild launches its Cafe Festival dynamic with the sale of meat empanadas during three evenings of all-night dancing. Instructor from Institute of Rural Education moves into village for one month intensive sewing course.

Internal: Auxiliary reflects on Project progress and discerns present contradictions during one day retreat at Guardian's home in Santiago.

Contradiction: Catalyzing broader participation of landowners in Project planning. (Wk. 4)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Inkind service of Rio law firm produces winning model on tax-exempt status. Global slide show is key event of first ICA: Brasil board meeting. IADB proposal is submitted for community unity programs. Irrigation system allows garden to flourish during dry season. Literacy classes begin with 18 in attendance. Musical instruments and sports equipment are secured to begin after-school classes. Sewing class meets twice a week in a community home. Four home garden plots are begun. Plaza clean-up is a daily occur-

rence in the area where new benches have been placed. Pumpkin is planted on the demonstration farm. Community meetings swell in attendance, as streets are corporately named for local founders.

Internal: After a week of house painting and bamboo bunk bed building, entire skills of the Bananeiras auxiliary are utilized—carpentry, decorating, gardening—in grand move to new house, barraca and cottage in the center of the village.

Contradiction: Creating miracles when daily doing is on target. (Wk. 4)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Do-ment takes on new intensity as Health Outpost treats 60 patients in first week. Stake IV builds a mini-park. New preschool building is lined out. Jamaica Development Bank representatives come for site visit. "Trinamic Trio" joins Jean Forbes in Kingston to break open ground for two GWFs in October. Visits to businesswomen, diplomat's wives, church and social leadership produce yeses.

Internal: House celebrates Lingafelter's tenth wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Living the broader vision that lends meaning and urgency to week-by-week maneuvering. (Wk. 13)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Translation of Conacaste HDP Consult document is completed and sent to the typist. Drinking water is available to entire village after pump repairs are made. White rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank transform the village plaza.

Internal: Auxiliary is organized in teams for the actuation of the Project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the Miraculous Million Campaign is on schedule with \$104,000 deposited. Ballarpur Industries finalizes village adoption. Development expands new funding arenas as Brussels receives Religious Order contributions and Levi Strauss executive attends Pisinemo Consult. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining geographic coverage and giving emphasis to where the money lies.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Bombay launches a new intensive model for the new HDTS grads along with an experimental Consult model. Training consciousness becomes a profound part of Phase I curriculum across the globe while the Academy reports new passion in pedagogy preparation. Chicago Nexus does a Week II PSU on the retreat, using John Dunne as a tool to push relating the retreat to a new orbit of the mission. Evening meal conversations, collegium intensity and the ecclesiola construct enable depth encounter with transparency and new levels of spirit consciousness. The key contradiction lies in the arena of moving beyond static images of research to break loose the necessary global network to freight the intense training demands and corporately forging the new images of spirit and missional service.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that HDP Consults held in 16 villages in Maharashtra bring total completed to 64, while Singapore and Hong Kong Nexus exchange staff with HDTS in Philippines and Bontoa Consult. Export Department of Sears International employs LENS to create its five-year strategy plan, and first of five workshops is held for Houston Chapter of the North American Society of Corporate Planners. Twenty-three CYFs are set up in Jamaica and 40 saturation strongholds are initiated across the North American continent. Bombay Nexus reports that LEV is ready to be actuated in villages. Brussels reports that Guardians task forces move toward unifying continental strategy via awakening synopsis and four-year HDP expansion screen. The key contradiction lies in the arena of interchange as the issues of fast communication of needs and wins arise and has to do with maintaining a hold on the priorities while keeping the battle in perspective.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that Hong Kong Nexus did a three-day Management Trek to Korea. Bombay receives Belgian government grant money. Brussels reports financial systems and budgets worked through with Cairo, Kamweleni and Nairobi Houses. Chicago reports on first Order Funds financial statement, exciting use of video equipment, and a task force designing the Management Trek. Management Centrum is working closely with the areas in building this year's budgets and systems. The key contradiction lies in the arena of clarifying the difference between the real situation and the story and symbols.
