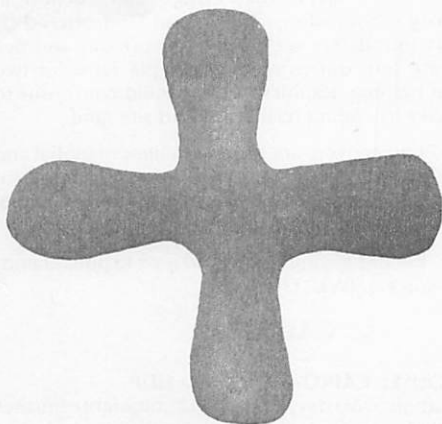


THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two more counties are covered with Town Meetings: Somerset and Cornwall. Major responsibility for Powerhouse work is picked up by local leadership in the absence of the auxiliary staff. Thirteen German/Belgian Christian Life Community Youth are hosted enroute to Tai'rgwaith Project.

Internal: Wayside Inn spinning with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use Ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: £100 arrives from the Scottish Engineer's Association in the midst of TM set-up in two new districts of Borders and Central.

Internal: Gemma Astori from Italy and Don Cramer of London arrive with stories, materials, new songbooks and help with TM set-up.

Contradiction: Enabling regional colleagues to assume total responsibility for TM Campaign in midst of family and other priorities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Completion of Adventure Playground marks the end of the rapid visibility phase, and community building negotiations herald the establishment of a solid economic sign.

Internal: The tribe attempts to settle in, as the lounge becomes international with 15 Germans, one Belgian, two English, and two French.

Contradiction: Focusing momentum while moving without having a plan to run with. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meetings are held in Lancashire and North Yorkshire, with one set up for Staffordshire, while group of clergymen in Gateshead consider Town Meeting format in September.

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diane Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Participation in Ferragosto celebrations in Termine, Rome and Puglia deepens understanding of the national traditions. Pope's death addresses whole country and world.

Internal: Long-range brooding on the Italian campaign reveals clarity on the other side of intensive engagement and radical discontinuity.

Contradiction: Building effective engagement patterns between summer and fall maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: ITI: Jos graduates 48 new participants from 11 states in Nigeria. Within the week, new grads begin visiting Ijede. Two requests for impact programs are received.

Internal: House reunites at closing feast of ITI.

Contradiction: Mshing new area excitement and project polishing into one focus. (Wk. 12)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuristic and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Regional Council plans for saturation maneuvers, approval for next four months funding by the Ministry and gridding Belgium to 216 micros, setting stage for next year.

Internal: New office decor and corporate timeline of Europe declare the new year in being.

Contradiction: Nailing down key issues so they can be dealt with. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Colleagues re-engaged in Global Community Forum campaign due to advantages gained by colleagues setting up GCF appointments; seeing a GCF grad about doing another Forum in his turf; and a check for GCF.

Internal: "Demon Demolition Maneuver" transforms House space into the land of the New Reality.

Contradiction: Using advantage of colleagues' social demonstration vision to release engagement in GCF maneuvers in the Netherlands. (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Manfred Golda arrives and participates in metro circuit in Saarbrücken which includes 3 committee meetings and visit to Benedictine Monastery. Thinking through TM METHODS AND strategies, planning the ICA booth at the Katholikentag in Freiburg with the CLC and mailing Newsletter occupies the home front troops. Participation at the Continental Council in Brussels as 5 people travel in VW bug in 4½ hours.

Internal: Staff arrival is completed and housing resettlement is the cap of the planning weekend. Hannah Muraya and Father Arnold with 4 CLC people.

Contradiction: Thinking thru the use of the employed and the uni-lingual as front line troops. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Renovation of *treffpunkt* basement takes major step forward with 1200 Deutsche Marks worth of electrical supplies donated by Siemens, Senioren celebrate "old rag" ball with result that two community women take responsibility for Senioren program themselves. Park Department delivers lumber for park fences and local citizens begin to build the railings. First year anniversary celebration day of Cafe Laterne is a huge celebrative and financial success!

Internal: Collegiums on maneuver explode and re-image House operating methods.

Contradiction: Updating the House on GRA and Priors Council while accelerating Project actuation. (Wk. 11)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Surveyors daily move on project as irrigation expert assesses total village scheme and team of civil engineers do preliminary work for major road-bridge construction in October. Primary school site is chosen and land offered by villager. Piggery foundation is dug in one work day and five farm trainees are sent out to commercial pig farm for two weeks practical training. Kapini's farmers build consensus to develop 300 acres in commercial crops and site land.

Internal: 1978-79 maneuvers are redone in light of global and continental priorities and Quarter I victories maneuvered for next five weeks. JTI grad Levi Chabala sojourns during school holiday.

Contradiction: Reconfiguring troops and time to pull off end-of-quarter maneuvers. (Wk. 12)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 a.m.—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Tuesday night Kawangware Leadership Meeting becomes time of reflection and vision as grieving local man sees the gift of both the life and death of their great leader and a way to move that greatness into the future. Guardian dynamic manifests itself with assistance given in securing work permit and passport. Site visit from Rotary releases interest in earth block house. The visitor is related to Housing Finance Corporation of Kenya.

Internal: Nicholas Kisumba arrives from Kamweleni to participate in Farm Training Program for three months . . . the first from outside Kawangware.

Contradiction: Being self-conscious and not entrenched in disabling patterns without seeing a way to move beyond them. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Health Guild and Preschool parents meet and decide to jointly build a Demonstration Community Kitchen for the preschool feeding program. Lease signed for land for Block Industry. First low cost demonstration house site selected. Immediate government funding and authorization are promised in abundance for dam building and social programs.

Internal: House welcomes Joseph Mwangangi, a community leader, for a month's sojourn in the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: Pushing the completion of dams, road and house roof before the rains. (Wk. 12)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTS and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: House hosts first Project Directors' Meeting of the year. Ninety around the table, including newly assigned national support forces, plan *Betting on Victory* campaign.

Internal: Emerging Generation captures the attention of all with arrival of Michelle Marie Anela Balm, daughter of Desmond and Liz Balm, born August 5th and the celebration of David Secunder Patterson's first birthday.

Contradiction: Orchestrating a do-ment campaign amidst launching a new round of 20 HDPs. (Wk. 11)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Vinay Jacob, Vivian Paul and Maxine Butcher attend project directors meeting in Bombay. Jane Coe plans with House for a shramdan (workday) in Madangir. Global Language School starts in St. Paul's School.

Internal: New songbooks bring back new spirit and Order memory.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers to intensify the mission and keep troops busy on the road in the midst of heavy rains. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: The first translation of the State Cooperative Society by-laws are translated into simple Telegu by Nadlapur HDP, ten charkas (wool-spinning machines) are produced and put to use, and new rope making machines are painted. Development and Medical officers consent and sanction a full-time nurse and health sub-station for Nadlapur. UST agrees to help market raise 60,000 rupees worth of wheat for use in the completion of the two kilometer Nadlapur approach road.

Internal: The auxiliary garden is fenced, ten new lime and four flowering trees are planted to enhance new auxiliary house, which is now complete. Mali and Pat Balm return to the Project with the Wards.

Contradiction: Re-orienting the Project auxiliary staff to see a common vision after a summer of discontinuity. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: First communication with Australia since telecoms strike. Brussels calls to coordinate staff transfers and air fares. Colleague and guest visit the Nexus and conversations revolve on job hunting.

Internal: Send out Stanleys to Apia and welcome Michael family from Germany on way to Sungai Lui and Kathleen Rees from Kelapa Dua. Contradiction: Having a new Nexus master

Contradiction: Having a new Nexus and mastering the intricacies of areal operations, in midst of no communication with one of its areas. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: All four stakes launch workdays: building a grandstand to the football field, creating two new bus stops and organizing a stake clean-up. The Project ferro-cement industry receives its first orders to build rice silos for the State Rice Board. Health Caretaker training is completed for 13 women with a trip to Queen Elizabeth Hospital.

Internal: Project is visited by Guardian couple from Kuala Lumpur who report on great GWF.

Contradiction: Achieving an immediate win in the middle of a multitude of long-range possibilities. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGA LUI

External: Nine village leaders meet after three months of inactivity to assess current sattu and explore ways of quickly moving toward project completion. Village head man affirms ICA presence and gives personal support.

Internal: Michael family arrives to give new insights and thrust to the mission.

Contradiction: Focusing the indirect village approach toward consensus and implementation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Victory! New chicken industry sells first 400 eggs (from the first of three stake chicken houses) to buyer who will take up to 10,500 weekly. Powerful regional/project maneuver planning for 78-79 takes one day, not three weeks as before.

Internal: House welcomes Cocks, sends out Nurul to Bayad via Maliwada HDTS and Atack and Soedarno to Bontoa.

Contradiction: Configuring staff and village for three campaigns in two regions and hitting the road. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village survey is completed as the last of 157 houses is visited. Four village leaders participate in the kabupaten (district) pre-Consult briefing and Minister of Home Affairs signs approval to do the HDP.

Internal: House returns to a normal timeline as a kitchen is established in our facility.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on different village factions and discerning who is the real leadership in the village. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO

External: House re-establishes government contact from national to village level. Regional colleague begins translation of Consult brochure for Bontoa HDP.

Internal: House establishes regional presence with temporary outpost at Ramayana Hotel, Ujung Pandang.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on Consult preparation while enabling colleagues and government consensus to form; turning promises into concrete actions. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House sends out Jim Oberg to Manila to continue the Development push there while resettlement continues with Barbara Scott and the Jenkins ticketed and on their way to India.

Internal: Entire Nexus participates in "painting party" in which the office, halls, three bedrooms and kitchen receive new life.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between patient waiting and effective preparation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The youth make a new decision to care for the whole community and combine with community girls into a formally structured group. They immediately take charge of the social programs and organize a sports day, an outing around Hong Kong, and repaint the village school, demonstrating their seriousness to all. Finance manager of large bank visits Project with architect guardian in preparation for loans to Nam Wai Foundation. Many visits are made to various factories to find an alternative product for the village factory and ensure a profit.

Internal: Two full-time permeation jobs being at International School and another part-time at the Chinese University, opening up many possibilities for GSF.

Contradiction: Creating ways for movemental guardians to participate in the Area Council dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Five villagers, the pre-school teacher, and two county officials depart for Sudtonggan (the first trip out of the country for all but one).

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Singer commits \$5,000 for 1979 expansion. Development receives \$6,000 in-hand Week 9.

Internal: House sends out Judy Albers and Russ Wheelock to North American assignments.

Contradiction: Grasping the real challenge of this year while experiencing the do-ability of our assigned task. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: New ICA sign goes up near the House giving directions to drivers. Metro group studies *Christ of History* every Tuesday night.

Internal: LaRoche's, on their way to Korea, celebrate their first anniversary of marriage at House Church and Pamela Macomber celebrates her 31st year.

Contradiction: Connecting the powerful motivity generated on the Hai Ou villagers trip to Sudtonggan with the task in Taiwan Quarter II. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Sow and piglet arrive. W.H.O. Asian regional director visits. Fourteen hundred pieces of Sudtonggan rock are delivered for Cebu Shopping Center. Road beautification project is begun in the midst of rumors of possible visit by First Lady Imelda Marcos.

Internal: House participates in a week of surprises as two visitors drop in. Russ Wheelock of Kansas City on a GSD tour and Tom Gould, both of whom report on India.

Contradiction: Operating in Week 9 as if the community models that the Yearly Planning Sessions create during Week 12 already existed. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Two thousand giant ipil-ipil are planted along the road by Bureau of Soil employees and Langub people; first delivery of charcoal is made to Durano; and city PopCom office sponsors a movie.

Internal: The week is highlighted by a study of summer speeches.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and corporateness while waiting for new staff. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Rooms found for Area Council meeting (and sleeping) while Area Prior is still trekking to all locations.

Internal: Begin school, teaching, internal life collegiums and house hunting.

Contradiction: Getting clear on priorities and maneuvers as we embody the Religious House dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Village treasury receives a 700,000 (won) deposit from Kwangyung primary school after two villagers were sent to Japan to develop money for the village. The Korean community in Japan donates money to the Kwangyung villages—Kwang Yung II, Kwang Yung E, and Kwang Yung Som. Village leaders celebrate a good harvest by holding a community picnic in the high pasture Preschool attendance jumps from 23 to 32 after summer vacation time. Village trading post is leased to a Kwang Yung II family and shows signs of new life.

Internal: House studies many other HDP Project documents to excite the global image of Kwang Yung II.

Contradiction: Struggling with how to encourage the villagers to assume more responsibility for the Human Development Project. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggyery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult document in Korean is given to printer, and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

Contradiction: Fighting five crucial battles on widely scattered terrain with one platoon. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: A visit with our key guardian colleague, Mr. Minigawa, and some of our student friends, begins to spin on possibilities and begins to get some picture on what we can concretely do with Chiiki Kon Dankai in Kyushu.

Internal: Surprise guest blows bottom out for students with spin on India.

Contradiction: Broadening colleagues' context and regional networks so that victory can be won. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: House experiences the engagement of both the secular and the religious sectors as Guardians affirm role of LENS and advise on preparations for November seminar and

Miss Satuki Okouchi comes to House Church with Rev. Nishihara before leaving for Oyubari summer training program.

Internal: Emerging Generation summer program, *Japan Jets*, takes off with seven E.G. from Tokyo and Osaka Houses, plus one from colleague family preparing their "village" spaces and building community.

Contradiction: Exposing the spirit dimension of the doing. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Oyubari Summer Program '78 is concludes with the 2nd Annual Logging Festival, followed by a campfire and folk dance in the evening. More than 120 people from seven different nations come to Oyubari during August to participate in the practical training dynamic through working with Oyubari residents. House enables the funeral of a community resident with transportation and bedding.

Internal: House takes a few days of discontinuity and ends the week with a House RS1 in Tomakomai city to prepare for the quarter ahead.

Contradiction: Articulating the Summer Program's significance for the future and avoiding the trap of reduced stories. (Wk. 12)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Packages mailed to all houses include development strategies for six week push to raise \$48,000 across the Area.

Internal: All new troops assemble as total house resettlement takes place to ensure space for everyone.

Contradiction: Putting solid flesh on assignments to ensure programs are spinning in the midst of consensed focal thrust for the Area. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: House receives \$350, \$300 from an individual we have never talked with, holds 13 Community Meetings and prepares State Assembly and CTC mailing as great Year of Australia event.

Internal: Jennifer Ross is sent out to Canada; youth lead collegiums; Neil's team wins basketball Grand Final.

Contradiction: Turning tension of Area Council assignments and regional priorities into victories for both. (Wk.10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: All community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lbs. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of their own responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Regional workshop results in 30 people assigned to task forces for implementing the Year of Australia, following a fine Area Council.

Internal: Whole House participates in Area Council and returns to celebrate Brown's arrival and the presence of John Burbidge enroute from India to Perth with a sumptuous Indian meal.

Contradiction: Meshing regional task forces in maneuvers that push the whole mission forward for the Year of Australia. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: First major grant of \$5,000 for Community Meeting Australia comes from R.E. Ross Trust. Two regional families spend school holidays in Murrin Bridge.

Internal: Operation *Dance of the Donors* maneuver is celebrated with Chinese rice and damper.

Contradiction: Finding a working base for the breakloose in donor development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Australian Development Assistance Bureau (NGO) approves ICA eligible for funding in the midst of hosting GSD maneuver building with five aborigines participating from three different communities.

External: Preparing move to shift Nexus procedures to Sydney House is on holiday and all 's bubbling.

Contradiction: P(as)ng n> 34eps in the Year of Australia on sunshine. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Mark Green attends Canberra PSU on maneuvers for 1978/1979. Scott Kennedy, new aboriginal sojourner goes to Murrin Bridge HDP. Preparation is begun for global slide show and field maneuver building, development and framing.

Internal: Painted and decored three more rooms, creating fine new guest room.

Contradiction: Creating momentum without having field maneuvers done. (Wk.12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Week II team from Sydney helps community residents paint two houses. Seventy tons of aggregate hauled for industrial shed and walkways. Walkabout team of five is sent out to Wilcanna for CMA.

Internal: Fasting and feasting abound, as brooding turns toward Area Council planning and the launching of the Year of Australia.

Contradiction: Keeping the "spring" in the tension. (Wk. 10)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: TASC team is on ship, which helps move the Bikini people to Kili and supports this move by selling food.

Internal: Begin "spring" cleaning in the fall to prepare house for planning and Metro Council this month.

Contradiction: Determining the real direction of the future while experiencing political freedom for the first time in a hundred years. (Wk.10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Samoan colleagues take newly arrived house staff on staff on site selection drive through 20 targeted villages.

Internal: All assigned staff arrive from the U.S. and Singapore in midst of delays due to mechanical difficulties.

Contradiction: Figuring out what the demonstration of project in Samoa will be in relationship to local development and government assistance already underway. (Week 12)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Strategy on *Saturation Maneuver: California* is formulated as whole house gathers in Richgrove with Los Angeles House amid feasting on cartload of local grapes.

Internal: House takes shape with arrivals of Huangs, Griffins, and Judy Albers and immediately launches self-support schemes.

Contradiction: Launching *Saturation Maneuver: California* in a way to enable all of house and regional colleagues to support and move as one thrust. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: First Richgrove Fair nets \$700 for Community Center Park and baseball diamond. Rabies clinic vaccinates 88 dogs. Third newsletter distributed. CETA framing and proposal writing opens more government doors in Tulare County.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

Internal: House hosts guests from Cusick and Mill Shoals Consults, Nam Wai HDP, sojourners and Development team.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of neighborhood participation as guilds "cover the waterfront" in several directions. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Economic guild meeting occasions new corporate resolve to win with financing for store expansion. Newsletter triples its circulation as it is mailed to entire school district.

Internal: House and Cusick residents travel to regional council to plan maneuvers for saturation, development, project acceleration, and experience broader regional corporateness.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and spirit in the midst of seemingly overwhelming quarter demands and staff shifts. (Wk.12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Maneuver Maniacs, Rug Crunchers and Barnstormers pitted against each other in fierce competition during indoor olympics to celebrate Regional Council planning victories: writing quarter maneuvers, choice of saturation sites, timeline and movemental designs..

Internal: Two high school girls arrive increasing House number by 2/3 and spinning initial image of CYF's.

Contradiction: Finding a working base for the breakloose in donor development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Six months of planning for the California HDP culminates in active involvement of surprising number of new and old colleagues from Los Angeles Region in HDP set-up and consultation alongside Richgrove citizens.

Internal: Bob Vance reports on Richgrove, grounding the story, the reality and commitment to HDPs.

Contradiction: Using Richgrove to advantage as a visible demonstration to increase the momentum and focus the Los Angeles region. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Community leadership enables auxiliary to move into vacant mission buildings.

Internal: After the third day in residence auxiliary takes solar heated showers.

Contradiction: Avoiding competitive images with established structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult prep becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food, household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Tri-metro foray visits old soldiers. House is invited to do series of Town Meetings in Clarks Fork of the Yellowstone Valley.

Internal: All three permeators working as 2 jobs are secured.

Contradiction: Focusing our targets for maneuvering and development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Quarter maneuvers are created. A training grant of \$5,240 is secured for Cannonball Industries.

Internal: House office is rebuilt and installed as new decor dramatizes claiming of new house.

Contradiction: Moving with limited local decision, while District Council remains in limbo. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Breaklooses in four target polises begin to shape our pre-maneuver planning.

Internal: House is pleased to be bursting at the seams with Denver and Salt Lake City staff in the Denver House.

Contradiction: Getting regional colleagues on board with saturation maneuvers through the regional. (Wk. 12)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: First development circuit of the year helps with Northwest Territories maneuver prep with signal gift of plane tickets worth \$900. Surprise of the week is job applicant who comes to dinner.

Internal: Neats sent out to Vancouver, R. Robins secures student visa, R. Woodbury lands job and both youth pick up team priorship roles.

Contradiction: Facing the unknown of the Northwest Territories and the necessity of rapidly surfacing regional troops. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: With Art Rowe returning from Bi-Areal meeting in Vogar and Neats arriving from Edmonton, House does intensive regrid of Vancouver region in order to enabling targetting and preparation for first saturation polises. In midst of complexity of preparations House begins to grasp first implications of saturation.

Internal: Inkinded celebration launches the year with riotous singing, flying plants and claiming of promises.

Contradiction: Engaging colleagues so as to win in doing saturation maneuvers, self-support and in obtaining new facility. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Ten-week Consult preparation maneuvers are completed in a record two days and implementaries are begun even before maneuvers are completed. Development team begins research and visitation, planting seeds for a quick harvest. First meeting of HDP Advisory Board works on framing for funding/authorization/consultants. Team is sent out on Pre-Site Selection trek to 20 Athabaskan Indian villages.

Internal: Ecclesiola night is kicked off with send out of trek team. Development team and bi-Areal Council team join in seafood celebration and profound informal conversation on Order life.

Contradiction: Finding ways to operate in the ambiguity of an HDP site not yet chosen which causes anxieties over development/authorization story, decisions on current facility, permeation and needs for the HDP consult. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Regional Council stimulates colleague participation with workshop on movement formation. House launches into week of maneuver workshoping and practices.

Internal: All house troops return (in one car) from Canadian Bi-Area and launch into a week of practices, maneuver building and Regional Council prep.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the urgency to move and the necessity to plan. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Proposal for purchase of the Community Store by local couple is submitted to ARDA. Auxiliary spends long weekend in Edmonton at Area Council. Vogar leadership development continues as Vogar Products operates on their own for two weeks. Vogar resident spends two days in Winnipeg researching Vogar Woodworks.

Internal: Religious House demonstration moves onward as linoleum is laid in collegium room, new lounge is created, and guest/auxiliary rooms are all refurbished.

Contradiction: Focusing limited troops on necessary village tasks while positioning ourselves for new program year with councils and maneuver planning. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Two Project mayors, nine participants from three HDPs, and 35 colleagues impact Area Council at Texas Southern University.

Internal: All priors participating in Area Council planning experience awe and wonder at gridding and budgets.

Contradiction: Maintaining balance during shift in emphasis from areas and counties to regions and micros and pulling together pivotal city, saturation and development into one thrust. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Preparation for Health Fair continues with new bathroom installed and new ceilings designed. Second movie shown with whopping profit. In-kind push iounts with new air-conditioner and refrigerator donated. Community Congress date set and task force assigned.

Internal: House excursion to Comanche County Rodeo and Fair delights all.

Contradiction: Timing the release of community spirit into motivating events. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: One thousand people attend *Welcome Back Migrants* celebration in the newly renovated Asherton Plaza. Plaza beautification is completed with donated plants and palm trees and beautiful cactus gardens. Asherton Library opens with first cards issued and books checked out.

Internal: Fourteen people visit from San Antonio and Houston for the fiesta weekend.

Contradiction: Creating quarter plan and Town Meeting maneuver that immediately puts us on death ground. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Regional Priors Meeting is held in Oklahoma City, including Houston, Dallas, Indiahoma and Oklahoma City representation. Plans for Quarter I maneuver begin. New and old leadership is welcomed.

Internal: Preparation for Priors' Meeting brings forth new decor and inkind leads.

Contradiction: Setting up contacts for whole year while starting first stronghold maneuver. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House plans Summer 78 celebration and send out to lift up Asherton and Indiahoma Consults and assignments shifts.

Internal: House gets a much needed face-lift as Adkinsons mysteriously show up to paint first floor.

Contradiction: Objectifying the wisdom gathered from last year's victory so that new eyes can appropriate it quickly and move into the new year. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Quarterly TM catalyzes *Prepare for Tomorrow* group to self-consciously decide to be the Secretariat and instructs ICA to "sit down" which forces corporate shadow flip to happen.

Internal: New team names indicate style of next quarter: Hunters and Warriors.

Contradiction: Solving the funding with Governor's office and planning issues with Memphis RH and New Orleans RH in time to launch Mississippi '200 TM' campaign at full speed ahead in one week. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Guardian catalyzes possibility for 100 new jobs in Asherton with broom and mop company subsidiary industry.

Internal: House accomplishes the great move into a new facility, symbolized by first House Church in just set up collegium room with total youth cluster present as well as key colleagues.

Contradiction: Focusing the quarter with priorities and maneuvers in the midst of continuing to meet overwhelming facility set-up demands. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Pace and Memphis lead second training workshop for Mississippi social services agency people and leave with appointment set with Governor Finch's assistants to present proposal for TM saturation in Mississippi. Richard Butler sends Arkansas Report with personal note to Governor Pryor.

Internal: Colleagues invited to Area Council using Sears WATS lines.

Contradiction: Winning by using the grid's gifts along with two years of field experience. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Whole House attends Area Council and participates in regridding the region. House receives \$1000 in the mail from regional colleague.

Internal: Self-support workshop enables House to see how it is possible to meet the budget while looking for jobs.

Contradiction: Putting practical form behind regional consensus. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Key community leadership hosts the Executive Director of the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation and is encouraged to present request for \$100,000 of the five million to be given away in January, 1979. "We want to emphasize rural development, and you are the best we have seen."

Internal: House celebrates the 15th anniversary of Ike and Charlene Powell and the birth of Joseph William, 7 lbs. 11 oz., both on September 7th.

Contradiction: Growing experience of community togetherness is subtly fanning the fears of racial prejudice. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Permeation job yields 6% raise. In-kind car is promised for two three-week maneuvers.

Internal: House hunting continues while youth start school in earnest and Robin Rafos begins lifesaving class at nearby Y.

Contradiction: Creating a common vision of the missional task to avoid "spazzed" interchange between phases. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: LENS strategy building continues in midst of good visits to McDonalds and Wards. A joint Operations/Development team is sent to Mill Shoals HDP, and materials, including clothing, is sent with troops to Lorne de L'Acadie HDP. Kang Byong Hoon's collegium reveals edge of HDP/local church relationship.

Internal: Three simultaneous stake (residential floor) celebrations allow everyone to crowd around the televised Ali-Spinks fight.

Contradiction: Coordinating field work to encompass long-range as well as day-to-day necessities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Area Council hosted with 125 in attendance, 12 hours and four projects represented. Auxiliary meeting with 40 people reviews summer accomplishments and Global Priorities, and sets Council date. Youth Employment and Training program for 40 youth is completed with reflection, trip to amusement park and supervisors' lunch.

Internal: Fresh paint, new decor and redecorated cafe are lasting benefits to house of pre-council preparations by assembled priors.

Contradiction: Handling multiple financial structures of Area, House and many programs which block implementation maneuvers. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Project community sees itself as totally responsible for securing auxiliary housing and contacts local priest for facility.

Internal: House travels to San Francisco for Area Council and teams up with Phoenix House to win first annual Area San Francisco Olympics.

Contradiction: Discerning tactical engagement amidst the three major maneuvers—self support, pre-Consult prep and Regional Council—each with conflicting demands on time and troops. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: The Annual Lions Club Watermelon Day Festival on Saturday marks the end of Phase II of the Project. Highlights include stake floats and the largest parade ever, a local history museum, all day flea market, games, rides, and free watermelon, volleyball and horseshoe tournaments, Lorimor T-shirts made on site, a two-hour visit from Congressman Tom Harbin, and at least 25 movement colleagues who visited for the day. Attendance was between one and two thousand!

Internal: Arrival of the Murphy family brings a tornado of activity to the House.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of the thrust of Phase III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Director of HEW: Kansas City requests meeting to discuss impact events in citywide educational structures. Region participates in Lorimor Watermelon Day.

Internal: House refurbishment takes another leap during two hour worknight session.

Contradiction: Designing time/task/forces constructs that will enable completion of space, decor and year images before Regional Council. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Regional Council is held with all metros represented and about 40 participants. Maneuvers are built and the regional glue structures are created through the yearly, quarterly and weekly time designs, writing of the regional song and a statement of the movemental covenant.

Internal: Ecclesiola focuses on The New Reality, using the talk on *The Immediacy of Fulfilled Living*.

Contradiction: Sustaining activity and discipline required to move majestically from the articulated maneuvers to the yearly implementation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Visit with Community Participation Advisory Commission in St. Charles indicates saturation prospects in January.

Internal: House and regional colleague family spends week transforming lounge into elegant collegium room.

Contradiction: Bracketing what needs to wait until next week. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Great signs focus spirit engagement as mural begins, third flower box has flowers in and paint/bake sale nets over \$150. Community elder sparks impromptu picnic with 35 attending.

Internal: House accelerates visibility as Mill Shoals T-shirts travel around the world to Saudi Arabic and Amy Carter.

Contradiction: Opening the community's eyes to the great accomplishments that are occurring. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Iron Range saturation campaign meeting numbers 18, including metro colleagues, Kinney residents, Minneapolis, and Kinney House troops. Mini-workday starts refurbishing of vandalized skating shack, and youth continue work on canteen.

Internal: With all troops in for the year, teams and enablement assignments are made, and a regular rhythm is established.

Contradiction: Continuing HDP momentum while starting saturation rhythm. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Twenty-four house members and bi-metro colleagues, including a couple with no previous contact, tour Fifth City and participate in workshop on contradictions facing the Milwaukee neighborhoods, then celebrate at Diana's Restaurant.

Internal: Timely inked gifts of fruit and vegetables and an influx of Order youth and sojourners enable the canning and freezing of foo to keep the troops on their feet and moving into and through the next quarter.

Contradiction: Beginning a fantastic new year with veteran colleagues who are so clear about both the glory and the pain involved in concretizing the victories of the year. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Bi-metro Council on Saturday engages 30 troops in building the quarter's maneuvers and three polis cadres accept responsibility for applying them to their territory. Louisville colleague, Barbara Schwartz, recruits hosts and enables slide report on her participation in Bananeiras for 15 new contacts.

Internal: House receives Janis Johnston as a fellow in the The Order and completes all new decor for the collegium room to rehearse victory in all three campaigns.

Contradiction: Enabling cadre's participation throughout the year in their yes to the stronghold strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Regional colleagues meet in Hamilton, Ohio, to frame pilot saturation stronghold and later meet in Cincinnati to frame the entire three year saturation campaign for Ohio.

Internal: Eighteen regional colleagues join the House for Ten Year Celebration with cake, champagne, art form conversation, Rip Van Winkle skit, singing and waltzing.

Contradiction: Getting a comprehensive actuation plan completed that assures do-ment of all facets of the task. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Council participants meet to rehearse maneuver building methodology in preparation for Guild's Quarter II maneuver workshop. Town Meeting campaign receives check in mail from Sears, Detroit group, for \$300 and readies cars for circuits.

Internal: House completes necessary construction on in-kind facility and symbolizes the year's new game with in-kind seats at Lions' pre-season opening football game.

Contradiction: Naming the immediate victory that claims the new year for the entire region. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The two day area strike force meeting builds plans for flying maneuvers with focus on colorful images for the three year victory.

Internal: House sends out colleagues to El Bayad, Africa and Minneapolis.

Contradiction: Building a transrational design of daily victory in tri-micros that demonstrates how 54 events can be done. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Colleague engagement in area and regional maneuver building at Area Council creates new focus.

Internal: Arrival of Stockings in time for Area Council and resettling House with new Daily Office space declares new year's beginning.

Contradiction: Avoiding the temptation to focus on what we know and launching into the big picture. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional meeting in Niskayuna pushes troops out into the turf.

Internal: Phoning blitzes into post-TM towns seed geography for Week II foray.

Contradiction: Accelerating the external mission without a clear understanding of new models needed. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: The entire House participates in Prior's Council while new sojourner holds down the homefront.

Internal: House members return from Global Prior's Council and Phase I camp, and one permeator receives \$100 per week raise.

Contradiction: Communicating the excitement, enthusiasm and historical significance of the GCF campaign to regional colleagues. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Regionalis is key as Saturday is spent in reworking Washington D.C. regional grid with colleagues from Baltimore and Richmond and then celebrating the summer and the coming year with metro briefing Saturday night.

Internal: House hosts youth group from Cleveland here to work in Ivy City, receives Mike Rush enroute to Isle of Dogs and sends out Sherri Rozenthal to North Carolina.

Contradiction: Moving from the discontinuous summer rhythm to building comprehensive weekly maneuvers that anticipate the next quarter. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: First West Virginian TM participant attends Area Council.

Internal: School starts for the Youth Cluster with high excitement and no study halls.

Contradiction: Doing the doing which builds consensus rather than conflict. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Area Strike Force meeting report offers methods to strategize the entire three-year saturation campaign and releases the House to engage in this campaign Day II and Week II.

Internal: A newly created Living Environment Odyssey construct impacts house and regional colleagues with 33 hours of continuous miracles taking place in a 39-hour construct.

Contradiction: Creating the appropriate metro level structures that will focus metro colleagues immediately on releasing both wisdom and energy for the tri-micro campaigns of Quarter III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Area maneuvers are launched with regional meetings for last Week II to select the tri-metro for saturation and to write the maneuvers to accomplish this quarter's emphasis.

Internal: House moves on intentional space design through tribal resettlement and creation of designated named rooms for regional colleagues.

Contradiction: Building a transrational design of daily victory that demonstrates how 54 events can be done this quarter. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

Internal: Decor-making clarifies our vision of the year by transforming concepts into visible reality.

Contradiction: Wrestling the temptation to do only the part of the year's plan that is most enjoyable or least difficult. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Project meeting celebrates the arrival of the Consult documents.

Internal: The Spirit Movement sings to the world in the Staten Island Ferry terminal.

Contradiction: Broadening the maneuver ground beyond the core of active supporters. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Twenty colleagues meet to plan regional maneuvers at six hour council in Portland, Maine.

Internal: House celebrates the beginning of six week sojourn for Roni McCall and welcomes Paul Clements to Boston metro.

Contradiction: Creating the corporate saturation story to release framing as first step in stronghold timeline. (Wk. 12)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Spurred by news of \$25,000 Molson gift, the house builds saturation strategy maneuver. Dates set for first four of 60 planned school committee forums in Montreal with school administrators giving enthusiastic support to the year's plan.

Internal: House transformation projects continue in the midst of a week of celebrations—a ride on the new metro line, a slide show with simultaneous translation into French, and "Saturday Night at the Movies" with *beaucoup* Molson's beer!!

Contradiction: Turning area strike force images over effectively to local Community Forum colleagues. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House and regional colleagues initiate the first HDP site selection trip in the densely populated heartland of Ontario.

Internal: Movement colleagues are mobilized in House search and guest list grows for every house event as colleagues call up house and invite themselves over.

Contradiction: Moving at high speed with three campaigns while creating the Religious House presence. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: House is represented at Canadian bi-area meeting in Vogar. First Canada-wide Council in eight years creates initial national image of HDP expansion strategy. Three thousand dollars worth of firefighting equipment is donated by City of Ottawa to Lorne Fire Department.

Internal: House renovation goes on to prepare for taking in boarders.

Contradiction: Deciding how to initiate regional saturation maneuvers and HDP set-up scheduled for completion by Christmas when New Day Canada in New Brunswick h1s first area priority until late September (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Seventy-one junk cars are hauled away from the community and two mobile classrooms for the education center arrive in a week of intensified struggle for community leadership to assume responsibility for Project by being board members of LEDC, LHDP, and Credit Union. New Day Canada teams plant seeds for network participation in Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island.

Internal: House visits historic Acadian village and participates in preparation for new Stringham baby by building a new room and attending a baby shower given by the community.

Contradiction: Managing many fronts and all supply systems at once. (Wk. 11)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Visits from Maryknoll, Guatemalan military attache and two key Guardians highlight visibility of the Project. Industry increases sale of dresses and receives order for a new style at higher price. Leadership meeting lists qualities of leadership and prioritizes three directions for the coming year: water to the houses, plaza, and chapel.

Internal: Borrowed TORO (rotary lawnmower), named the *machine of the thousand machetes*, creates lawn space out of the jungle. Daily Office and War Room are created and initiated.

Contradiction: Including village leadership in comprehensive planning. (Wk. 11)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Village equipment pool begins with the arrival of a blue shining tractor. Wednesday evening guild meeting begins child care structures. Saturday workday is orchestrated by two leaders—an auxiliary and a local village—who coordinate the planting of 1,500 trees in all five sectors of the community.

Internal: Slides from Consult illuminate village transformation impacting the auxiliary and initiating further reflection.

Contradiction: Catalyzing celebrative events for three-day Chilean Independence Holiday without clear picture of poast rhythms of the fiesta. (Wk. 12)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; preschool with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Foundation of new preschool is dug in time for first supply of building materials. The industry delivers 12 chairs, and eight students are registered for secondary school. Health Acceleration Week is highlighted by the repair, painting, supplying and opening of the health outpost, the commissioning of 11 stake health caretakers and authorization of the Human Vitality Corps program through participation by Ministry of Health and W.H.O. officials.

Internal: The Health Acceleration team collegiums on other HDPs excites the auxiliary with the reality of the global band.

Contradiction: Moving agriculture and commerce without a fail-safe strike model. (Wk. 12)

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is transformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports framing visit with John Garnet, head of Industrial Society in U.K., is promising for support of ICA. Last minute windfalls of \$20,000 from an individual, \$25,000 from Mulsen Foundation in Canada, and signing HUD contract for \$80,000 enable August closing at \$226,000. Quarter II maneuver planning exposes many new targets for funding old and new projects and programs. New orbits in framing signal expanded funding potential for projects and programs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of establishing a system for movement on multinational corporation priorities.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Singapore focuses on preparation for mobile training school in SEAPAC. ITI grad recommends in writing that all religious in West Africa attend the ITI. Chicago completes *The Journal* while is sent for printing and binding. Collegiums and reports concerning the development of the HDTS allows the Research Centrum to function as a truly global band. The key contradiction lies in the arena of bringing focus to the training demands and faculty assignments for Quarter II.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the completion of Quarter II maneuvers. Signal events are a health trek to Woburn Lawn, Global Women's Forum in Lorimor HDP and visit from Brian Smith, returning from working in three projects. A new role for Global Operations Centrum is emerging as the Centrum forges out models that anticipate and inform the future beyond the immediate pressures of the field maneuvers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of refining the quarter's timeline in order to focus engagement and put weekly urgencies in perspective.

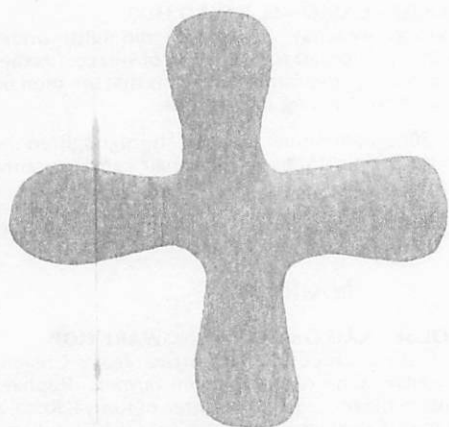
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Brussels yearly maneuvers in the theatres of global audit, Order finance, commonization, Project capital monitoring and legal finesse. Singapore reports arrival of Harpers, enabling continuity of management as Stanleys depart for Apia. Chicago has fine module of Week II task forces and plans the Centrum space. Getting new models and designs for the quarter and year in place turns Centrum forward rather than backward. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unprioritized immediate demands delaying corporate brooding and action on long-range constructs and models.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two more counties are covered with Town Meetings: Somerset and Cornwall. Major responsibility for Powerhouse work is picked up by local leadership in the absence of the auxiliary staff. Thirteen German/Belgian Christian Life Community Youth are hosted enroute to Tai'rgwaith Project.

Internal: Wayside Inn spins with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use the ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional gathering to share summer context becomes international affair with representatives from Australia and Italy. TM set-up meeting triggers requests from adjoining communities for three other TMs.

Internal: Self-support is well underway as Marge Allen heads out to new administrative position at 150% of last year's salary.

Contradiction: Orchestrating awakening advances so that every one creates a chain reaction. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Completion of Adventure Playground marks the end of the rapid visibility phase, and community building negotiations herald the establishment of a solid economic sign.

Internal: The tribe attempts to settle in, as the lounge becomes international with 15 Germans, one Belgian, two English, and two French.

Contradiction: Focusing momentum while moving without having a plan to run with. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meetings are held in Lancashire and North Yorkshire, with one set up for Staffordshire, while group of clergymen in Gateshead consider Town Meeting format in September.

The people shouted, the trumpets sounded. When they heard the sound of the trumpet, the people raised a mighty war cry and the wall collapsed then and there.

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diane Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Development contributions this week include a 200 franc (\$46) gift from *Vivre Montaudin* Association (a group created out of a GCF). Addressograph-Multigraph: France delivers a 1250 press with 1000 free GCF workbooks.

Internal: The week of space recreation and House resettlement is culminated in time for a grand Area Church.

Contradiction: Initiating the quarter's maneuvers while preoccupied with past campaign debts and post-summer campaign momentum. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Participation in Ferragosto celebrations in Termine, Rome and Puglia deepens understanding of the national traditions. Pope's death addresses whole country and world.

Internal: Long-range brooding on the Italian campaign reveals clarity on the other side of intensive engagement and radical discontinuity.

Contradiction: Building effective engagement patterns between summer and fall maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: ITI: Jos graduates 48 new participants from 11 states in Nigeria. Within the week, new grads begin visiting Ijede. Two requests for impact programs are received.

Internal: House reunites at closing feast of ITI.

Contradiction: Meshing new area excitement and project polishing into one focus. (Wk. 12)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: European Continental Council launches the year with 80 people planning the campaign maneuvers.

Internal: The international team presence for less than 24 hours unites the efforts of Development Centrum with authorization strategy for Africa, NAME and Europe.

Contradiction: Releasing immediately spendable cash while setting up the whole Development year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Area Council plans Quarter II maneuvers.

Internal: House hosts Schrijnen extended family and Stefan Vanistendall.

Contradiction: Creating the story which puts the first saturation victory on the timeline. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Colleagues re-engage in Global Community Forum campaign by setting and keeping appointments.

Internal: "Demon Demolition Maneuver" transforms House space into the land of the New Reality

Contradiction: Using advantage of colleagues' social demonstration vision to release engagement in GCF maneuvers in the Netherlands (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two workshop leader training sessions are held in Mulheim-Sud and Vogelstang. Manfred and Hanneri Golda and Blase Sands prepare to assume responsibility for Frankfurt metro colleagues. Elizabeth and Manfred attend Vatholikentag youth conference in Freiburg to staff joint CLC (Jesuit) and CA booth on volunteer groups' participation in HDPs.

Internal: With everyone home for a brief time and the children in school, House has PST on Town Meeting workshop leader training.

Contradiction: Allowing the Quarter II plan to be built comprehensively rather than as a reaction to the awareness that the communities' calendars are presently in charge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Renovation of *treffpunkt* basement takes major step forward with 1200 Deutsche marks worth of electrical supplies donated by Siemens. Senioren celebrate "old rag" ball with result that two community women take responsibility for Senioren program themselves. Park Department delivers lumber for park fences and local citizens begin to build the railings. First year anniversary celebration day of Cafe Laterne is a huge celebrative and financial success!

Internal: Collegiums on maneuver explode and re-image House operating methods.

Contradiction: Updating the House on GRA and Priors Council while accelerating Project actuation. (Wk. 11)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Surveyors daily move on project as irrigation expert assesses total village scheme and team of civil engineers do preliminary work for major road-bridge construction in October. Primary school site is chosen and land offered by villager. Piggery foundation is dug in one work day and five farm trainees are sent out to commercial pig farm for two weeks practical training. Kapini's farmers build consensus to develop 300 acres in commercial crops and site land.

Internal: 1978-79 maneuvers are redone in light of global and continental priorities and Quarter I victories are maneuvered for the next five weeks. ITI grad Levi Chabala sojourns during school holiday.

Contradiction: Reconfiguring troops and time to pull off end-of-quarter maneuvers. (Wk. 12)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 a.m.-12 midnight) under village generalship and broad participation of village, finishes water pipe to tank site. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting is highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: The first of three combis arrive from Colgate Palmolive for KHDP. One of original ten farmers Raphael Njoroge, secures manager's job in rural area of Kenya. Rose, a two-year veteran of Kawangware Youth Corps (KYC), returns to Kawangware to do field training with KYC following seven-month training in government school for directors of Harambee Nursery Schools. Eleven goats arrive at Nairobi Airport and are transported to the nearly completed poultry house at DUF. Staff visit with Abadallah, director general of Muslim Council, results in offer of support in arenas of finances and authorization for Muslim Village in coastal province.

Internal: Hawa and Alberto Rosario and their three children join auxiliary in preparation for new Project at coast.

Contradiction: Grasping the depth of life in Kenya and releasing the long-term power of the Kenyan for the world. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Health Guild and Preschool parents meet and decide to jointly build a Demonstration Community Kitchen for the preschool feeding program. A lease is signed for land for Block Industry. First low-cost demonstration house site is selected. Immediate government funding and authorization are promised in abundance for dam building and social programs.

Internal: House welcomes Joseph Mwangangi, a community leader, for a month's sojourn in the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: Pushing the completion of dams, road and house roof before the rains. (Wk. 12)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Among the victories reported at Project Directors Meeting is a breakloose of the Nava Gram Prayas Cadre being formed through the national support forces. House ties down possibility of a rag factory in Chikhale and box factory for Gorthan.

Internal: House hosts Project Directors Meeting with the 20 new Project directors being sent off to advanced training. House sends out Jaime Vergara from HDTS to Philippines and welcomes Nurul from Kelapa Dua and Augusta Jayasakara.

Contradiction: Finding industrialists who can support all the villages by providing training, supplying materials and assuring marketing of goods. (Wk. 13)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Old contacts introduce us to major industrialists and to a member of Parliament for village funding and authorization. GWF is set for September 9th with over 40 participants already registered.

Internal: Study of Erich Fromm's *Art of Loving* impacts House and colleagues at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Demonstrating hope in midst of city fearful of kidnapping and floods. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Brussels calls to coordinate staff transfers and air fares. Colleague and guest visit the Nexus and conversations revolve around job hunting.

Internal: House sends out Stanleys to Apia and welcomes Michael family from Germany on their way to Sungai Lui and Kathleen Rees from Kelapa Dua.

Contradiction: Mastering the intricacies of areal operations, during strike which cuts off Nexus communication with one of its areas. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: All four stakes launch workdays: building a grandstand to the football field, creating two new bus stops and organizing a stake clean-up. The Project ferro-cement industry receives its first orders to build rice silos for the State Rice Board. Health Caretaker training is completed for 13 women with a trip to Queen Elizabeth Hospital.

Internal: Project is visited by Guardian couple from Kuala Lumpur who report on great GWF.

Contradiction: Achieving an immediate win in the middle of a multitude of long-range possibilities. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Nine village leaders meet after three months of inactivity to assess current status and explore ways of quickly moving toward Project completion. Village head man affirms ICA presence and gives personal support.

Internal: Michael family arrives to give new insights and thrust to the mission.

Contradiction: Focusing the indirect village approach toward consensus and implementation (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Victory! New chicken industry sells first 400 eggs (from the first of three stake chicken houses) to buyer who will take up to 10,500 weekly. Powerful regional/Project maneuver planning for 78-79 takes one day, not three weeks as before.

Internal: House welcomes Cocks, sends out Nurul to Bayad via Maliwada HDTS, and Atack and Soedarno to Bontoa.

Contradiction: Configuring staff and village for three campaigns in two regions and hitting the road. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village survey is completed as the last of 157 houses is visited. Four village leaders participate in the kabupaten (district) pre-Consult briefing and Minister of Home Affairs signs approval to do the HDP

Internal: House returns to a normal timeline as a kitchen is established in the facility.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on different village factions and discerning who is the real leadership in the village. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: First Community Meeting is held with 100 Bontoa residents in three languages: English, Indonesian, and Makassar. The first corporate village action is making a Bontoa map. Lebaran (Islam New Year celebrating year 1398) visit with new governor, Ujung Pandang mayor, head of Department of Social Affairs, and others yield informal nod.

Internal: House number doubles as Atack and Soedarno arrive from Sarno.

Contradiction: Securing immediate funds while working on long-range financial plan with government and private sector. (Wk. 13)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House welcomes Jim Oberg back from Manila Development to plunge into Hong Kong Development. The loose ends of ticketing across the areas are tied up. Nexus hosts Hong Kong Area Council in an inkind conference room at the Sheraton Hotel.

Internal: Baunknights arrive as the Centrums do maneuver planning and the Nexus celebrates Hong Kong style with a stand-up dinner at MacDonalds followed by ice cream and a tour of Food Street. Area Council pauses to watch the Ali-Spinks fight live on TV. The wedding of Kenneth Hamje and Judith Hess is celebrated as the finale of the Hong Kong Area Council.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with old models. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The youth make a new decision to care for the whole community and combine with community girls into a formally structured group. They immediately take charge of the social programs and organize a sports day, an outing around Hong Kong and repaint the village school, demonstrating their seriousness to all. Finance manager of large bank visits Project with architect Guardian in preparation for loans to Nam Wai Foundation. Many visits are made to various factories to find an alternative product for the village factory and ensure a profit.

Internal: Two full-time permeation jobs at International School and another part-time at the Chinese University, open up many possibilities for GSF.

Contradiction: Creating ways for movemental Guardians to participate in the Area Council dynamic. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Five villagers, the pre-school teacher, and two county officials depart for Sudtonggan (the first trip out of the country for all but one).

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Singer commits \$5,000 for 1979 expansion. Development receives \$6,000 in-hand Week 9.

Internal: House sends out Judy Albers and Russ Wheelock to North American assignments.

Contradiction: Grasping the real challenge of this year while experiencing the do-ability of our assigned task. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Translation of Senator Charles Percy's Fifth City speech in June and the Global Priorities is underway. House writes maneuvers in preparation for Quarter II Council in Area Hong Kong.

Internal: Macomers celebrate 11th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Synchronizing external and internal operations into one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Decision of four families (seven adults and 16 children) to intern at Langub HDP is announced at guild meeting. Village plans *despidida* (farewell party) for the night preceding departure. Road workday of whitewashing rocks proceeds in midst of torrents of rain. Three nights of quarterly planning generate excitement over new proposals in each guild. Twenty-three rock cutters and wives take field trip to see the luxury houses and shopping center made of Sudtonggan rock.

Internal: Rebecca Cabute from Langub and Teresa Marshall, Liz Barkony and Cindy Booher from Chicago arrive in time to celebrate the year's first House Church.

Contradiction: Falling back into old patterns when radically new patterns are called for in this third year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Two thousand giant ipil-ipil are planted along the road by Bureau of Soil employees and Langub people. The first delivery of charcoal is made to Durano. City office sponsors a movie.

Internal: The week is highlighted by a study of summer speeches.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and corporateness while waiting for new staff. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Tokyo House has party with 32 colleagues, welcoming the Clarks and seeing Lee Ferguson off to Nigeria.

Internal: Decor is 90% finished with the year's images serving as dialogue between House and guests.

Contradiction: Focusing images while planning for Area Council. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG II HDP

External: Village treasury receives a 700,000 won deposit from Kwangyung primary school after two villagers were sent to Japan to develop money for the village. The Korean community in Japan donates money to the Kwangyung villages—Kwangyung II, —Kwangyung E, and Kwangyung Som. Village leaders celebrate a good harvest by holding a community picnic in the high pasture. Preschool attendance jumps from 23 to 32 after summer vacation time. Village trading post is leased to a Kwangyung II family and shows signs of new life.

Internal: House studies many other HDP Project documents to excite the global image of Kwangyung II.

Contradiction: Catalyzing more village responsibility for the HDP (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult document in Korean is given to printer and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

Contradiction: Fighting five crucial battles on widely scattered terrain with one platoon. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Two women from House journey to Haha to do three meetings in three days with a little help from colleagues there. The trip culminates in a small CYF, a *Chiiki Kon Dankai* (Town Meeting), and an HRM, all led by Japanese.

Internal: House builds maneuvers in relation to Area Council preparation.

Contradiction: Creating a practical plan for volunteers and staff to allow full participation in breakloose of TM in Quarter II. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Over 30 key Guardians and Movement colleagues meet each other at open house in new facility.

Internal: House sends out the Griffin family, welcomes the Stoner family and introduces the Clark family, new Area priors.

Contradiction: Organizing internal life so that it is enabling to the missional task. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Oyubari Summer Program '78 concludes with the 2nd Annual Logging Festival, followed by a campfire and folk dance in the evening. More than 120 people from seven different nations come to Oyubari during August to participate in the practical training dynamic through working with Oyubari residents. House enables the funeral of a community resident with transportation and bedding.

Internal: House takes a few days of discontinuity and ends the week with a House RS1 in Tomakomai city to prepare for the quarter ahead.

Contradiction: Articulating the Summer Program's significance for the future and avoiding the trap of reduced stories. (Wk. 12)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Visit with leading company director secures promise of introductions to major companies in Sydney for Development push.

Internal: House hosts Development PSU team as it sets the maneuvers for each region for the coming month.

Contradiction: Finding the new sociological form of engagement of Those Who Care. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

Internal: *Thornbird* readings are oasis during week's doing.

Contradiction: Locating the bird dogs to break loose Development and State Assembly Maneuver. (Wk.13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lbs. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of their own responsibility and role of the auxiliary.(Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Regional workshop results in 30 people assigned to task forces for implementing the Year of Australia, following a fine Area Council.

Internal: Whole House participates in Area Council and returns to celebrate Brown's arrival and the presence of John Burbidge enroute from India to Perth with a sumptuous Indian meal.

Contradiction: Meshing regional task forces in maneuvers that push the whole mission forward for the Year of Australia. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: First major grant of \$5,000 for Community Meeting Australia comes from R.E. Ross Trust. Two regional families spend school holidays in Murrin Bridge.

Internal: Operation *Dance of the Donors* Maneuver is celebrated with Chinese rice and damper.

Contradiction: Finding a working base for the breakloose in donor development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House visits with Canadian ambassador who gives a C.I.D.A. book to assist proposals for Apia Consult and referrals to New Zealand C.I.D.A. funding. A key visit with Sir Gustav Nossal, one of the world's leading immunologists, places ICA in new orbit of advocates for funding. Thirty-three at a PSU on finances and Development for area write maneuvers to deal with present financial crunch and prepare new ways for cash to flow.

Internal: House sends out Marge Tomlinson and Wanda Holcombe to Indonesia, George to Brisbane, Whites to Sydney and receives Bronwyn Rees from Termine.

Contradiction: Doing all the authorization required all at once instead of serially. (Wk. 13)

External: House creates symbol for Town Meeting: Pacifica as we launch the awakening campaign in Area Suva.

Internal: Two Order youth, David Higgins and David Ellsworth, arrive unexpectedly in the midst of planning the Eight Great Suva Maneuvers for the next year.

Contradiction: Waking up the stake colleagues after old patterns have renewed themselves during the summer. (Wk.13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Meeting with key Samoan women declares victory of GWF campaign across the South Pacific.

Internal: House builds consensus for engagement in next 16 weeks through creation of House and regional rationales and maneuvers.

Contradiction: Discerning the immediate critical actions while timelining the maneuvers that will insure victory. (Wk. 13)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Regional Council brings consensus on the maneuvers for this quarter and celebrates with a dinner theatre featuring *The Music Man*. Development raises \$13,000, getting positive response to Levi-Strauss presentation and seven people committed to Guardians Consult in Chicago.

Internal: A week of effulgent eventfulness culminates in a leisurely full-moon lit dinner/dancing cruise for the House celebration.

Contradiction: Locating the unthought through arenas so that victory for the area and House is ensured. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: First Richgrove Fair nets \$700 for Community Center Park and baseball diamond. Rabies clinic vaccinates 88 dogs. Third newsletter distributed. CETA framing and proposal writing opens more government doors in Tulare County.

Internal: House hosts guests from Cusick and Mill Shoals Consults, Nam Wai HDP, sojourners and Development team.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of neighborhood participation as guilds "cover the waterfront" in several directions. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Economic guild meeting occasions new corporate resolve to win with financing for store expansion. Newsletter triples its circulation as it is mailed to entire school district.

Contradiction: Finding a working base for the breakloose in donor development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Campaign Night engages metro colleagues in Regional Council planning and preparation. VISTA proposal for Richgrove moves one step nearer to approval. House participates in California planning and workday at Richgrove, releasing creativity for saturation breakthrough.

Internal: Recreation of corporate space nears completion as freshly painted walls lure new decor.

Contradiction: Finishing space transformation so that full energy is released for saturation. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: First Regional Council in three years (first ever held in Cannonball) births a three-week awakening maneuver model.

Internal: The spirit event of the House trek is a baseball game between Billings and Cannonball.

Contradiction: Releasing colleague engagement in midst of separation of local concern and global priorities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Industry manager, George Fool Bear, and Richard Kroeger attend industry marketing weekend in Kansas City and spend time in Kansas City and St. Louis Religious Houses. Project hosts Regional Council, which includes two colleagues from the Bismarck area and a softball game in which Billings leaves Cannon Ball to practice for the next Council.

Internal: Project entertains Lorenze Construction Company to celebrate their participation in store expansion.

Contradiction: Creatively deploying forces in the midst of broadening demand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Thirty-eight people from four metros attend Regional Council. Five maneuvers are created, and 40 people are assigned to four Commissions to care for Denver Region.

Internal: House begins to finalize preparation for Regional Council.

Contradiction: Launching the saturation maneuver while tending to critical details which will build foundations for the year. (Wk. 13)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: First development circuit of the year helps with Northwest Territories maneuver prep with signal gift of plane tickets worth \$900. Surprise of the week is job applicant who comes to dinner.

Internal: Neats sent out to Vancouver, R. Robins secures student visa, R. Woodbury lands job and both youth pick up team priorship roles.

Contradiction: Facing the unknown of the Northwest Territories and the necessity of rapidly surfacing regional troops. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

Internal: House locates new facility while transforming present space for maneuver.

Contradiction: Welding together saturation maneuver and House quarter plans as one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: House completes Quarter III maneuver writing with breakthrough into faster use of maneuver methodology.

Internal: House celebrates launching of its new configuration and the deployment of troops to the British Columbia maneuver.

Contradiction: Winning the victories before seeking battle. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Proposal for purchase of the Community Store by local couple is submitted to ARDA. Auxiliary spends long weekend in Edmonton at Area Council. Vogar leadership development continues as Vogar Products operates on their own for two weeks. Vogar resident spends two days in Winnipeg researching Vogar Woodworks.

Internal: Religious House demonstration moves onward as linoleum is laid in collegium room, new lounge is created, and guest and auxiliary rooms are all refurbished.

Contradiction: Focusing limited troops on necessary village tasks while positioning the rest for new program year with councils and maneuver planning. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Two Project mayors, nine participants from three HDPs, and 35 colleagues impact Area Council at Texas Southern University.

Internal: All priors participating in Area Council planning experience awe and wonder at gridding and budgets.

Contradiction: Maintaining balance during shift in emphasis from areas and counties to regions and micros and pulling together pivotal city, saturation and Development into one thrust. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Health Outpost renovation continues with paneling and sheetrock donated. The new bathroom is near completion. Club presentations include Rotary, Optimist and Chamber of Commerce. Parks funding research continues while land is being cleared.

Internal: House inkind four nights of roast beef when food budget hits bottom.

Contradiction: Securing Health Fair exhibits in midst of constant building renovation. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: A visit from Henry Bonds of Greenwood Mop and Broom secures new broom manufacturing industry to begin December 1. Community-hosted barbeque honors VIPs. Library is kept open two days a week by community volunteers. Septic tank hole is dug for Head Start program.

Contradiction: Creating the economic plan for upgrading commercial services to hold money in Asherton when salaries from new industry come in. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: The Ponca City maneuver begins rolling in a big way with initial town visits, feedback on easy set-up for TM, GCF and GWF in tri-micro towns. Two-thirds of the food is inkind and lodging is secured.

External: Community people write *The Voice*. The sector meeting (Memphis, New Orleans, Pace) concretizes design for doing stronghold maneuvers. Preschool staff, along with Senator Alexander and Representative Jackson, recommend 100% funding for the next three months. TM Mississippi, Ltd. is incorporated and submits a contract to the Governor's Office.

Internal: First Ecclesiola yields newly-found decision.

Contradiction: Implementing the community's new decision to assume direct responsibility for the Project. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Colleagues gather for celebrative evening in new house with new-area priors and staff. The decision is made to support Town Meeting and slip in an RS1 in New Orleans sector.

Internal: Dorothy Baines arrives to complete the staff.

Contradiction: Feeling out strongholds while making the House totally ready to enter Quarter II. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Experimentation with saturation set-up in Nashville metro leads to surprise at the willingness of the mayor, county judges and banker to phone, travel, host and work. Two new Guardians register for October Consult. House hosts Development team as Pace and Memphis work on contexting key city people.

Internal: Trip to Blues Alley and inkind wins for weekend meeting in Pace get us off on goat footing.

Contradiction: Forgetting to think maneuvers in every task. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: House participates in Regional Council at Gibson which starts with a work day to paint the community center a brilliant yellow. The maneuvers designed for the quarter hold the comprehensive thrust of the region in three campaigns.

Internal: Evening dinner conversations focus on the poetry of Langston Hughes, Carl Sandburg and the Psalms, creating Profound Humanness poems.

Contradiction: Claiming a major self-support victory while gearing up for the saturation campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Key community leadership hosts the executive Director of the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation and is encouraged to present request for \$100,000 of the five million to be given away in January, 1979. "We want to emphasize rural development, and you are the best we have seen."

Internal: House celebrates the 15th anniversary of Ike and Charlene Powell and the birth of Joseph William, 7 lbs. 11 oz., both on September 7th.

Contradiction: Creatively channeling the fears of racial prejudice which the growing experience of community togetherness is subtly fanning. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: An Evening at the Institute held at the church draws 45 and much supportive response. A Town Meeting-style planning event generates deep awareness among leaders of the congregation and paves the way for more such events in the future.

Internal: Visit by Tim and Kay Lush revives a faded vision of how all House members can share the full missional intent.

Contradiction: Creating authentic consensus on the vision of the mission. (Wk. 13)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: A typing marathon produces a 124 page document for AID on the first 24 HDPs. Phase One picks 40 bushels of apples and presses 200 gallons of cider. Management receives 322 barrels of roofing compound. The Alaskan HDP site selected is Minto, population 200, mostly Indian, one and a half hours from Fairbanks by air.

Internal: Nexus celebrates space transformation with a progressive dinner to each of the Centurms.

Contradiction: Launching saturation out of the local turf rather than at an institutional level. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: House hosts Area Council with 125 in attendance, 12 houses and four projects represented. Auxiliary meeting with 40 people reviews summer accomplishments and Global Priorities, and sets Council date. Youth Employment and Training program for 40 youth is completed with reflection, trip to amusement park and supervisors' lunch.

Internal: Fresh paint, new decor and redecorated cafe are lasting benefits to house of pre-council preparations by assembled priors.

Contradiction: Handling multiple financial structures of Area, House and many programs which block implementation maneuvers. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Project community sees itself as totally responsible for securing auxiliary housing and contacts local priest for facility.

Internal: House travels to San Francisco for Area Council and teams up with Phoenix House to win first annual Area San Francisco Olympics.

Contradiction: Discerning tactical engagement amidst the three major maneuvers—self support, pre-Consult prep and Regional Council—each with conflicting demands on time and troops. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: The Annual Lions Club Watermelon Day Festival on Saturday marks the end of Phase II of the Project. Highlights include stake floats and the largest parade ever, a local history museum, all day flea market, games, rides, and free watermelon, volleyball and horseshoe tournaments, Lorimor T-shirts made on site, a two-hour visit from Congressman Tom Harbin, and at least 25 movement colleagues who visited for the day. Attendance was between one and two thousand!

Internal: Arrival of the Murphy family brings a tornado of activity to the House.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of the thrust of Phase III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Signs of the new possibilities for this year were seen with the regional visits to the Lincoln, Omaha and Salina cadres. The University of Missouri's School of Management decides to offer LENS as a part of their program.

Internal: Ecclesiola with 30 present includes guests from Brazil (Sharon Turner), Cannonball, and Bangkok.

Contradiction: Producing plans for action at a Region Council which is to be nonchalant. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: A Town Meeting is set in Virginia, Minnesota as a prelude to 15 or more neighborhood and organization Town Meetings. This will give a clue as to how cities of 10,000 or more are saturated using Town Meeting and impact programs. Internal: House pulls off some "mini-miracles" and takes a trip to the great arch.

Contradiction: Building modes of authentic metro engagement. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Work Saturday continues into the week, resulting in approximately five acres cleared for park and picnic area. Global framing team works with auxiliary and local residents to produce nine proposals for economic development.

Internal: Nancy Knowlton is welcomed on her way to Memphis assignment.

Contradiction: Keeping sensitive to the pulse of the community, both to avoid pitfalls and to take advantage of opportunities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: The new roof for Kinney Sports House is being built by Community Service Corp.

Internal: House enjoys delicious potluck dinner and plays cards with community at Sunday weekly planning session.

Contradiction: Creatively deploying forces in the midst of broadening demand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The year is launched with 35 colleagues at the opening House Church. Development team tells the India story in the context of authentic demands to churches and individuals across the bi-metro, exploding the House's vision.

Internal: House watches Mohammed Ali in the ring, followed by an art form conversation on generalship and grand strategy.

Contradiction: Discerning how to use networks and colleagues to get mass impact job done. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Calendar building by metro cadres, stronghold selection and timelining cause new excitement. Old colleagues see new opportunities for their own contribution and participation as well as new possibilities for drawing in new colleagues.

Internal: House begins week with three anniversary and one birthday celebration and concludes with a trip to an Asian art exhibit and a Chinese feast to send Au Po Yee out to Academy.

Contradiction: Providing enough openness to take new advantages seriously and enough permanence to get things done. (Wk. 13)

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Meetings in the turf with new metro colleagues and old hands launch set up and framing maneuvers in three of the region's tri micros

Internal: Sr Elizabeth Kelliher of the Franciscan Sisters of the Atonement arrives from Manhattan's Lower East Side to sojourn

Contradiction: Releasing colleagues to do Town Meetings rather than dwelling on internal operations. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: A visit with a colleague at State Department of Community Affairs brings possibility of impact courses and permeation.

Internal: Ecclesiola study of Bonhoeffer's paper illumines dichotomy of presence of Kingdom of God.

Contradiction: Releasing our imagination to create the models which claim space and task. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional meeting in Niskayuna pushes troops out into the turf.

Internal: Phoning blitzes into post-TM towns seed geography for Week II toray

Contradiction: Accelerating the external mission without a clear understanding of new models needed. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: The entire House participates in Prior's Council while new sojourner holds down the homefront.

Internal: House members return from Global Prior's Council and Phase I camp, and one permeator receives \$100 per week raise

Contradiction: Communicating the excitement, enthusiasm and historical significance of the GCF campaign to regional colleagues. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: "The forgotten" are the focus as senior citizens hold dinner and bingo game and decide to form a Senior Citizens Club. The youth hold a talent show after intensive rehearsal sessions. Finally, the economic is focused as Ivy City Corporation Board of Directors begins three weeks of intensive work.

Internal: Quarter II preparation and regional meeting are focuses as new decor is made.

Contradiction: Moving on the Third Campaign without building structures too early. (Wk. 13)

External: Into the turf! A round of meetings and phoning sets up the base for saturation of Dover/Denville/Florham Park. Metro colleagues forge the form of the Extended Order.

Internal: Thursday is devoted to "finances done corporately."

Contradiction: Designing and assigning accountability for tri-metro set-up. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Regional meeting initiates saturation. In Starks, stake meetings are held in all five stakes, and VISTA slots are assured.

Internal: Old blue, the inkind, four-wheel drive van, finally arrives, bringing the total assigned staff together for the first time.

Contradiction: Building an imaginal momentum into stake and guild meetings. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Regional planning meeting in Portland, Maine is the key event of the week as 12 strongholds are selected and put on a timeline. The meeting also includes local representation from Starks, Maine.

Internal: Decor-making clarifies our vision of the year by transforming concepts into visible reality.

Contradiction: Wrestling the temptation to do only the part of the year's plan that is most enjoyable or least difficult. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Project meeting celebrates the arrival of the Consult documents.

Internal: The Spirit Movement sings to the world in the Staten Island Ferry terminal.

Contradiction: Broadening the maneuver ground beyond the core of active supporters. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Twenty colleagues meet to plan regional maneuvers at six hour council in Portland, Maine.

Internal: House celebrates the beginning of six week sojourn for Roni McCall and welcomes Paul Clements to Boston metro.

Contradiction: Creating the corporate saturation story to release framing as first step in stronghold timeline. (Wk. 12)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Series of Nights at the Institute concludes with new global slide show. A total of 23 new colleagues are impacted by House style.

Internal: First driver's license turns new French-speaking sojourner into new French-speaking circuiter.

Contradiction: Discovering in the midst of intense formulation maneuver that saturation is still an awakening campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House and regional colleagues initiate the first HDP site selection trip in the densely populated heartland of Ontario.

Internal: Movement colleagues are mobilized in House search and guest list grows for every House event as colleagues call up House and invite themselves over.

Contradiction: Moving at high speed with three campaigns while creating the Religious House presence. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Meeting in Alexandria of the planning commission for rural areas of Glengarry County considers a series of 15 Issues Forums for their towns. House does speaking engagements with the Ottawa Kiwanis Club at the Chateau Laurier and the Businessmen's Conference on National Issues in Montreal.

Internal: Parish Hall (auxiliary house) in Lorne burns, leaving auxiliary in care of the community.

Contradiction: Trusting interest created by last year's awakening events to catalyze saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Economic and social commissions meet and decide resident signatories for LHDP, Inc. and LEDC, Inc. (Lorne Economic Development Commission). Two Lorne residents go on week-long circuits for ink and promotion for New Day Canada Assembly (September 28—October 1).

Internal: Thursday night dinner is interrupted by fire which, in one hour, burns the parish hall to the ground.

Contradiction: Symbolizing the loss and the possibility occasioned by the fire in the midst of the urgency of preparation for the New Day Canada Assembly. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Visits from Maryknoll, Guatemalan military attache and two key Guardians highlight visibility of the Project. Industry increases sale of dresses and receives order for a new style at higher price. Leadership meeting lists qualities of leadership and prioritizes three directions for the coming year: water to the houses, plaza, and chapel.

Internal: Borrowed TORO (rotary lawnmower), named *the machine of the thousand machetes*, creates lawn space out of the jungle. Daily Office and War Room are created and initiated.

Contradiction: Including village leadership in comprehensive planning. (Wk. 11)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Village equipment pool begins with the arrival of a shiny blue tractor. Wednesday evening guild meeting begins child care structures. Saturday workday is orchestrated by two leaders—auxiliary and local village—who coordinate the planting of 1,500 trees in all five sectors of the community.

Internal: Slides from Consult illuminate village transformation, impacting the auxiliary and initiating further reflection.

Contradiction: Catalyzing celebrative events for three-day Chilean Independence Holiday without clear picture of past rhythms of the fiesta. (Wk. 12)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operates on regular schedule. Pre-school with two community teachers opens. A collapsed bridge is repaired. Phase One implementation plan is completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Do-ment takes on new intensity as Health Outpost treats 60 patients in first week. Stake IV builds a mini-park.

New preschool building is lined out. Jamaica Development Bank representatives come for site visit. "Trinamic Trio" joins Jean Forbes in Kingston to break open ground for two GWFs in October. Visits to businesswomen, diplomat's wives, church and social leadership produce yeses.

Internal: House celebrates Lingafelter's tenth wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Living the broader vision that lends meaning and urgency to week-by-week maneuvering. (Wk. 13)

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Conacaste HDP Consult document is completed and sent to the typist. Drinking water is available to entire village after pump repairs are made. White rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank transform the village plaza.

Internal: Auxiliary is organized in teams for the actuation of the Project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

Global Development Centrum reports the year's plans taking shape as Brussels builds maneuvers and Hong Kong Area Council assigns twice the number of weeks for Development circuits as any previous quarter. Bombay puts four teams on the road and Greaves Cotton agrees to release money for direct funding of Kendur. Iowa circuit takes slide show to 10 churches, including updates for five who have adopted villages; and produces three new adoptions and three who know Lorimor and make the connection, with great affirmation. Inquires are received from several congregations while three thousand five hundred dollars arrives from Methodist Committee. One congregation indicates interest in giving \$40,000. All point to a new wave of concern. The key contradiction lies in the arena of landing wins for every team now, while maneuvering to win in the long range.

Global Research Centrum reports that Maliwada HDTS registration leaps to 116 as the monsoon school gets underway. Only eight participants have less than seven years of education. New constructs emerge for the Philippine HDTS, for shorter Consults that can be done by monitoring teams on their circuits, and for the distribution of apple cider from *The Center of the Earth* Student House apple orchards. At Chicago Nexus, an ITI debriefing and strategy day, training construct and one person from each nation in Area Hong Kong on the way to Academy give form to future tasks. The interchange function of Research is intensified as space is re-created in Chicago. Under the rubric of "the walls come tumbling down," strike forces are used to get the Ecclesiola Manual out and reports are received from troops in place around the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building the comprehensive universe of research arenas, including critical use of time and troops before the complexity sinks the troops into immediacy.

Global Operations Centrum reports the writing of *Opus Seven Overture Maneuvers* in Bombay to launch the Centrum during the seven weeks until completion of the next round of consults. Singapore reports beginning of Serusup handicraft industry with promise of facility from government. Site selection in Alaska is begun. Twenty Uptown 5 guilders participate in a Week II of maneuver building. A fine collegium on Guardians Consult preparation helps deal with apparent "agorophobia"—fear of open spaces—as everything opens up additional opportunities. The key contradiction lies in the arena of sharpening our methods in all locations.

Global Management Centrum reports on the ability to obtain low air fare rates from London to Singapore. Brussels cleans up the 1977 Orfin books, closes its year, and reports preparation for European Continental Council in process. EDGE trip to San Francisco nets \$111,00 annual collateral savings. Space sparkles with new decor and painting in time for Nexus visit. Bombay reports a new auditor from Aurangabad works on books before submission of the latest report and 20 new Project directors are on the road to new assignments. Imaginal reporting of management responsibilities and accomplishments is a new trend. The key contradiction lies in the arena of inadequate cash flow, unconsented spending priorities, and immediacy demands which push longer range planning to the background.
