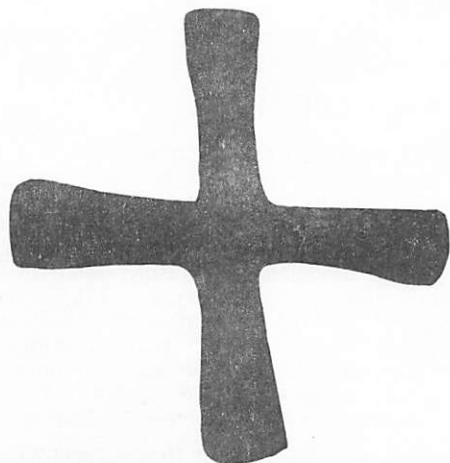

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Sixty invitations are sent out for "Evening at the Institute." Two CYF dates are set.

Internal: Carol Poole and Butcher return from visits with family. Mary Poole joins the chaos and the two Pooles fix exciting Egyptian feast.

Contradiction: Implementing a long-integrated plan of engagement in the midst of responding to the named immediate need. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Mailing of Maharashtra needs nets one colleague prepared to go to India and follow-up call allows three to say yes to Area Council. Lothian educator requests use of ICA methods and leadership at weekend conference.

Internal: Ruth Dyhr takes car to London for week of Development and CYF planning.

Contradiction: Pressing the sensitive nerve which allows communities to respond quickly to impact events out of their deep care. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Economic breakthrough continues with two and a half hour management board meeting, visit from WDA finance accountant and capital funding trip to London. Local people participate in judo demonstration and Garnant TM workshop. Village shakes off winter doldrums with first planning meeting for the summer carnival.

Internal: House celebrates the stay of Petra and Michael, German students, with Black Forest Gareaux and homemade elderflower wine.

Contradiction: Transforming good ideas in the social and human arenas into victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Community Youth Forum team of Jennifer McClelland and Christine Mead lays groundwork for three Forums—two in Manchester polis and one in Sheffield polis.

Internal: Adam Thomson breezes through Manchester from Nairobi LENS trek to celebrate Paul Thomson's second birthday and is sent out to France polis completion trek.

Contradiction: Doing Quarter IV Week One Development maneuver to meet April Development target. (Wk. 13)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: The Diamond Hexagon Campaign moves into full swing with six intercontinental teams plus a Development team. House holds eight more Forum Communitaires, sets three additional dates and makes 16 authorization calls. A car is inkinded for three weeks with 300 liters of gas. Remaneuvering session is held at a facility inkinded from INODEP (Ecumenical Institute of Geneva).

Internal: Great Saturday night fling as teams return from the field with stories, skits, dance, pizza and wine allows distance and releases Sunday strategy session.

Contradiction: Broadening operational geography while accelerating effectiveness of the Diamond Hexagon Campaign. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: First chair leg is bent. Three electrical installation trucks converge on Termine opening up a new street, catalyzed by wiring needs of industry building. Bulldozers prepare secondary village roads for cobblestones. Invitations for April 7th industry building opening go out.

Internal: Representatives to European Council arrive with reports of great event, and full program check. Strike force troops, Roger and Joyce Williams, follow.

Contradiction: Remembering your revolutionary context in the midst of prolonged maneuvers on roof, wiring, machinery and marketing. (Wk. 13)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Six Ijede villagers complete passport applications to symbolize readiness to attend HDTI:Kawangware. Two thousand chicks arrive as a result of conversation with Barclay's Bank loan officer. Accomplished rural health doctor, Hilton of Garkida Project in N. Nigeria, has dinner with several auxiliary staff, invites Project to send a villager for training. First accurate map of Ijede is finally finished and duplicated for stakes.

Internal: Weekend of village celebrations has all staff, including youngest Emerging Generation, aglow with celebrative spirit.

Contradiction: Grasping the internal and external financial implications of village industrial ventures. (Wk. 13)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Development receives extra impetus from Third World troops and Management Centrum.

Internal: House turns inside out for indoor spring fever picnic. Week II conversations allow exciting reflection on Belgium.

Contradiction: Reducing task to that which is immediate and handleable. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Twenty-five percent of village comes to TM in stronghold. A second French training session at House with Paris troops continues House interchange.

Internal: Morning with Global Operations Centrum clarifies issues and victory circle for House.

Contradiction: Polishing a stronghold while setting up two more. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House spends three hours with head of Overijssel Province Director of CRM (National Cultural Ministry) in a collegial call (he has been to Inyan Wakagapi) which helps reflection on strategy and story relative to the powers that be in the Netherlands. House meets with cultural council in Overijssel to plan March 15th meeting to introduce local officials from across province to DD. House discovers over 100 local DD contacts to send newsletters to.

Internal: House hosts young couples on their way (in June) to Kamweleni for six months.

Contradiction: Creating authorization milieu for program which enables creating programmatic milieu for authorization. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: With Elizabeth and Tolman on continental maneuvers in France and Manfred in the Cologne Region all week, Hannerl hits the road alone to pull off scheduled TMs in the far corners of the Frankfurt Region.

Internal: Seventeen-year-old Susanne Fricke decides to spend her school holiday visiting, simplifying the strategies in the House arenas of newsletter translation and typing, and preparations for the Deutschland portion of the Great European Spring Maneuver.

Contradiction: Overcoming the illusionary sensation that next quarter is a long way away, with only one week of Quarter III remaining. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Imaginal Education Course is held with particular emphasis on curriculum writing for children's program. A *Haustreffen* (stake meeting) involves enough Turkish participation to necessitate German to Turkish translation. Financial crisis produces three-pronged Development thrust.

Internal: Maria Maguire decides to spend her Easter school holidays in India.

Contradiction: Telling the common story that motivates people to move again. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Monthly Bilharzia eradication campaign is kicked off with every family visited, and three more water taps put in. A new kiln for the brick factory is completed. Twenty contributors and Guardians are hosted in Cairo and shown the Global Film, a fine evening.

Internal: Development Systems team, Panchayat visitation and the Dettmans, Guardians from Minnesota, pass through and bring with them many gifts, including a copy of the global film.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum in the midst of manipulating the red tape for usage of land for desert reclamation, brick factory, and new building site. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Community businessmen decide to take responsibility for cost of flood light in the square. Turning it on again after many months transforms plaza and community once more. Commercial Bank of Africa holds great LENS course with indications of more to come. CYF at St. Mary's (boys school) with form five and six impacts youth. Nursery school committee decides to take responsibility for total operations as Assistant Chief Kibe holds the comprehensive picture. Visit with Miss Margaret Kenyatta results in a "yes" to GCF in Lavington which will be first GCF within the 15% for Nairobi.

Internal: Send out of Loudermilks, Adam Thomson, Tom Greyshock and the Panchayat (Joyce Ollison, Rob Duffy, and the Wilsons) and welcoming of Spencer, Williams and Stan Gibson pushes image of what it means to be a pivotal city and keeps the beds warm.

Contradiction: Keeping all eyes on the prize, not being diverted by immediacies. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Five villagers are cleared to receive Rs5,000 agricultural loans each on Republic Day. Sugar factory agrees to buy village cane crop at double the price received locally. Stake meetings begin. Visit by Block Development Officer assures of his firm support.

Internal: Sripal, a village youth, dies and auxiliary and villagers celebrate his completed life.

Contradiction: Locating permanent village facility and formalizing guild structures to unblock tactical thinking. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Village leaders are sitting waiting for meeting to start when auxiliary staff arrive in village. Visit ends with one of village teachers asking, "When will you return?" Presentation at Calcutta Rotary Rural Development Committee meeting opens doorway to many companies and organizations.

Internal: Area Guardian from Calcutta accompanies ICA to village.

Contradiction: Broadening base of private sector support for the HDP. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: With all centurms on the road, House Church is conducted by Deaconess.

Internal: Phil Heywood sojourns on world tour with three weeks scheduled in Sungai Lui.

Contradiction: Ensuring that being the servant in the Zone does indeed care for the homefront. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Fascination with machines allows for the eventfulness of stake *gotong rayongs* with chain saw and new lawn mower. Trips as ambassadors to other communities include two health caretakers accompanying Sabah Foundation flying doctor in helicopter to villages inaccessible by road preparing for a state-wide demonstration of ICA health care methods and 25 handicraft workers journeying by inkinded bus to a large handicraft fair and exhibit 50 miles away.

Internal: House collegium room is in fine shape to welcome unexpected emissary of Chief Minister, head of Community Development Center.

Contradiction: Training the emerging leadership while using the entire village to bring off the victories. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGA LUI

External: Villagers experience the successful completion of the Mara Industrial Complex, done completely by local labor and local foremen. First quilting class with one woman from each stake opens up unexpected possibilities of selling knit glass covers and silk flowers which they already know how to do. Sixty, mostly female, attend English class tutorial, catching the young male teachers a bit off guard. Continued German corporation Development opens up nearby town of Seremban. New try is made with the planting of corn, chili and bean seeds from the Agriculture University. The complete package training proposal for the year of 1979 with a budget of US\$33,000 is ready to deliver to the five corporations which have requested it.

Internal: John Cock leads a village meeting of 16 through the global context and sets the stage for the upcoming methods module. Rich Michael and Ruthe Yost have everyone rolling off their chairs by performing a singing duet at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Spending the US\$10,000 Canadian grant money left in credit before the April 1st deadline, when the categories of acceptable expenditure are continually shifting and the context changing. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Loans extended by Development bank make cumulative total of 26 boat motors since September. GCF total is eight now with total village leadership. Bubun Headman participates in Kuala Lumpur impact trek and authorization calls. North Sumatra University students and lecturers make 24-hour visit to Bubun. House participates in singing and weekly planning session and meets last minute demand for Bubun display at Medan fair, 40 days exhibition.

Internal: Gail returns from impact treks in Kuala Lumpur and Bontoa, and Chairul leaves for HDTs: Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Releasing internal structures in the face of the need for constant care and travel to move implementation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Key businesswoman in Ujung Pandang in kinds four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Entire House attends mosque for Mauhid, celebration of Mohammed's birthday.

Contradiction: Objectifying land ownership situation to release economic paralysis. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Two Nexus personnel participate in 105 GCFs in five days on Mactan Island.

Internal: Return of most troops allows possibility of low-key mind-blowing reporting and visioning on breakloose across zone.

Contradiction: Accelerating momentum occasioned by the breakloose while keeping one eye on the necessary future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Another week of calling sets up two GCFs. Youth begin to tackle issue of youth center. Project purchases first equipment for dental clinic. Four companies decide to visit on the same day.

Internal: Philip Haywood visits and Roy Philbrook arrives for Development trek.

Contradiction: Expanding responsibilities of village leadership corps without handing on impossible situations. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guards says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Forty businessmen gather for lunch at five-star hotel to look at future of ICA in Philippines and to receive thanks for their past support. Development presents 20 new proposals. Levi Strauss delivers 100 pairs of Levis and T-shirts for the 50 Filipino "blue shirts". An order for villages to produce new craft item for export is received after site visit to Sudtonggan. Citibank, pleased with their Rock Industry investment, now offers to buy jeep for transportation system of five Mactan villages.

Internal: House has end of Development trek celebration with brunch at local restaurant.

Contradiction: Staging the next leap now, with victory for the year in hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Four counties turn gold during the week with Cultural Affairs Program in Lions Clubs, impacting over 200 people with human development activity throughout the globe. First circuit of all of Taiwan is completed with dates now set in every county for the Cultural Affairs Program. Area Development trek brings in US\$750 in hand, with promises of over US\$1,100 for next week.

Internal: Taipei and Taichung metro colleagues join in the staffing of the county Lions Club programs.

Contradiction: Maintaining intensification of thrust in all maneuver arenas simultaneously. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan 216 assembly marks triumphant completion of 222 forums in 100 sitios of Mactan. Eighty-three forum leaders produce 594 proposals in 32 education forums, 34 GWFs, 28 CYFs, 31 ECFs and 97 GCFs. Twenty "sister" villages are chosen as next step in Mactan expansion. Levi Strauss donates levis for Blue Shirts.

Internal: Asher Ertel arrives for three-month sojourn.

Contradiction: Discerning the leap that will catapult the cluster model to the globe. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Agriculture breakloose begins with new vegetable farm planting. A borrowed tractor plows three hectares for mango farm. The fence gets up on the goat ranch and mushroom production increases to one new batch a day. Water pump is obtained for water system and two new water tanks are donated. First doctors to visit new health clinic treat over 100 people.

Internal: House welcomes Sr. Diana from Manila as sojourner and Department of Agriculture assigns one field worker to live with House and work full-time in Langub.

Contradiction: Giving the load to the village. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Town Meeting sponsorship is presented to top management of three major Japanese companies. Mitsubishi Oil calls back in 24 hours with "yes" decision. Hilton International joins sponsors list. Wednesday holiday features GWF by Japanese staff and global film event at the House.

Internal: Yoshi Koshiyama celebrates his 21st birthday by quoting JFK and declaring his decision to serve others. Molly Shaw's sister arrives for a two-week visit.

Contradiction: Turning the willingness of companies to release employees as volunteers into people on the road every day. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Preschool board of directors meets to discern next steps in registration. Lee, Bel and Park visit provincial Saemaul head and vice governor in relation to Project expansion.

Internal: Ecclesiola conversation and Daily Office witnesses on Dark Night impact House.

Contradiction: Finding a way to catalyze corporate planning and gathering the consensus of the village toward the future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House experiences week of abounding opportunity as Song Chul accompanies Peace Corps survey of leper village community development possibilities. Korean Methodist church gives initial nod to grant of \$10,000 lot east of Seoul for training center, and head of 400,000 Methodist women indicates GWF interest.

Internal: Discomfort of two heatless days in freezing weather and frozen water pipes give way to warm greeting for back House checks and arrival of third ITT grant.

Contradiction: Deciding rather than wondering about how to loose the secret of history in an ancient society immersed in economic recreation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU ERI—KUH DU ERI HDP

External: Three mountainside reservoirs tap springs and villagers complete two miles of meter deep ditch dug, piped and filled by hand to complete tap water system for every home in village—replacing 3,000 years of well system. First two sows litter—18 piglets at \$80 each for 400% return on investment. County picks village for subsidized herd of ten dairy cows with guaranteed milk contract and issues permit for grazing on 5,000 *pyong* pasture.

Internal: First Seoul office sojourner is shoehorned into corner room and househunting burner is turned up a notch as landlady gives quit premises notice—three times.

Contradiction: Torching bridges behind House while not knowing whether they may yet prove to be the way forward. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The region resounds with a TM of over 230 on Masaki. Present were 21 local leaders, representatives from each family in the parish and people from each of 50 blocks in the *Cho* (neighborhood). In Shikoku 12 TMs were set up last week, so the Fukuoka region now has 15 TMs set for the Spring so far.

Internal: With the whole House out on circuits, colleagues enable Emerging Generation and task force leadership.

Contradiction: Coordinating the maneuvers that are going to gold Japan and be ready for the snowball that is coming. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Tottori Prefecture turns gold as the Catholic Church of Yonago in Tottori Prefecture holds TM with fine document and new vision of responsibility in church and community. Osaka and Fukuoka combine efforts to do a one week Shikoku Island TM maneuver, resulting in seven dates set and seven TMs working. Osaka and Hokkaido complete Tohoku Maneuver with the return of two House people. Saturday night event celebrates the week's victories.

Internal: First Japanese TM sojourner completes last week of sojourn. House knows the presence of colleagues as great gift and very necessary and looks forward to many more coming. House welcomes Fukuoka colleagues in preparation for Shikoku and Kinki joint TM maneuver.

Contradiction: Putting the necessary detail on the broad operating images. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: House sends out troops to begin month-long maneuver for TM in Japan's "Northeast" district and completes logistical arrangements. Hiroshi Fukuyama participates in site selection of new Project in Okinawa.

Internal: House sends out Miss Hur Myung Hee after three months of global presence in Oyubari.

Contradiction: Changing lives rather than doing good deeds. (Wk. 13)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Preparations for launching of CMA South Australia step up with new campaign brochure printed, inked food and stationery pouring in and a Development call which results in introductions to the twelve key businessmen in the state.

Internal: Old faces bring new life as House welcomes Terry Loomis to ecclesiola and Rob Duffy in transit.

Contradiction: Revitalizing the troops and sharpening finesse to produce a fine quality campaign which will involve both old and new colleagues in its execution. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Visit to Premier's Department and Uniroyal Tire Company highlight week of breakthroughs in authorization and Development.

Internal: Kimberly Smith is inducted as student prefect at Adelaide High School.

Internal: House celebrates Justin and Delores Morrill's 25th wedding anniversary with eventful evening that pushes exploration of what that rite can be.

Contradiction: Designing the corporate strategy that creates an experiment, using fluid troops, that prepares House for the summer and next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: The fear of time-consuming task of creating the newsletter is turned into fascination as House discovers the writing is completed in one day and the mailing in an evening, which proves system works.

Contradiction: Finding pillars in the flood—extensive positive local referents as grounding points. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Week of Panchayat Visitation catalyzes evenings with Charlottesville core and Albany and Binghamton metros. Colleagues whom House has not seen for some time reappear.

Internal: Future directions spin with Panchayat leads to animated discussion of future directions and interactions of HDP, TM and region.

Contradiction: Winning with the firewood industry quickly in the face of accelerating opposition while enabling the community to take responsibility. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Four dates for TMs set in Brockton and Laconia strongholds. High school assigns metro student to Minto, Alaska out of careers program.

Internal: House celebrates Ahren Stock's first birthday and continues review of basic methods with charting method study.

Contradiction: Maintaining the intensity of the stronghold in the midst of planning regional and area councils. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House participates in the "Great Week of Regional Swirls" with area newsletters sent to three other regional Houses, 360 newsletters mailed to colleagues in Montreal and Quebec and a regional framing collegium which targets 25 colleagues for nurture and assignment.

Internal: With eyes on the global mission through sneak preview of global film, House focuses on Open House preparations, installing commercial in-kind carpet while sending three from the House to Ontario Saturation and Minto Consult, achieving highest week yet in self-support, and sustaining youth on a term paper typing marathon.

Contradiction: Refocusing the mission to allow the journey of much-needed, new colleagues. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House full of women makes it easy to concentrate on GWFs with the result that several leaders of women's groups get excited and thus support the events.

Internal: Former galaxy pastor (from Montreal) and wife, the Johnsons, come for House Church and are impressed with House style.

Contradiction: Making sure that the GWF program is geographically and socially comprehensive so as to ensure a saturation base. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Portland forum kicks off North Leeds Development days. Sudbury committee decides on 15 forums for April. Multi-cultural youth action forum in Thunder Bay proposes cross-community student exchange program.

Internal: Feverish preparation of new forum workbook causes strange and unearthly time design.

Contradiction: Refining saturation strategy to produce crowds as well as events. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DEL'ACADIE HDP

External: Development trips net \$1200 cash and \$30,000 in loan from a religious order. Saturation assists with 500-person event that came from Community Forum proposal. New weekly rhythm in LEDC office includes methods training. Adult education classes begin new sessions using *Alternatives* and *Campaign News* for conversations. *Voice* is produced and distributed, arranged by Youth editor, Humel LaPointe.

Internal: Permeation team locates three job offers over \$12,000, all four to six hours away and accepts one.

Contradiction: Giving priority time to critical proposal-writing in the maneuver plan. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Entire community shuts down its normal Friday evening activities in order to attend *sector foros*, (stake TMs) which return a sense of possibility to the community.

Internal: House sends Rod Worden out to permeation in the United States.

Contradiction: Maintaining calm, creative decision making, despite pressures of a heavy week of final preparation for community store opening. (Wk. 1)

Internal: The guild grows to 18 with lots of offers of help.

Contradiction: Selecting Project site within reasonable distance from Lima. (Wk. 1)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Two local greenhouse employees chosen by the community start work on the construction at the four greenhouses and begin planting zucchini squash. The sewing industry workers receive salaries for work on school uniforms. Fourteen women attend a 36-hour first aid class two days a week. The GWF team arrives and plunges into preparations for the Forum in Santiago.

Internal: Participating in the home spruce up campaign by sector, the auxiliary digs the black muck out of their septic hole, nicknamed "The Dark Abyss".

Contradiction: Making long-range decisions which have significant consequences beyond the vision. (Wk. 13)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Saturday workday clears land at the demonstration farm for new crop of beans. Mr. Dethe arrives and begins walking the village and working on community map and design. Teams are dispersed to Rio, Rio Bonito and San Jose to recruit GWFs. The *prefect's* (mayor's) wife in Rio Bonito calls a meeting of the town's prominent women, who agree to host the GWF and send representatives to Bananeiras. ITI recruitment forges forward with meetings with both Methodist and Catholic bishops, who promise participants. Three hundred pieces of bamboo are cut and readied for chicken fence.

Internal: Collegiums on Peruvian village site selection and continental strategies excite auxiliary with new possibility beyond Bananeiras.

Contradiction: Finding forms for nurturing new sense of community responsibility and engagement. (Wk. 1)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and in-kind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Bellingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: One hundred twenty-five women attend first GWF in Conacaste.

Internal: House sends out the Castro family to visit other Latin American projects after a week of sojourning here.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the irrigation project to actualize the dream now planted in the minds of Conacaste farmers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Authorization and site selection continue with visits to Singer, Catholic Relief Service, Auxiliary Bishop of Lima Schmitz, Landar Pacora, Dean of ESAN, a graduate business school, and the advisor to the Vice Minister of Economics and Finance. Site visits include second visit to Sisicaya and two hair-raising hours up a mountainside toward Santiago de tuna.

WEEK ONE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a week of US foundation gifts ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000. Freedom from Hunger proposal for Serusup is sent to Brussels. Guardian luncheon in Manila is attended by major supporters, highlighted by a talk from Deputy Minister Marquez from the Ministry of Local Government and Community Development. Corporations take active role in both funding and personnel throughout the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building momentum for cash in hand while placing emphasis on base of support for all programs.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports in-the-field research as the Hong Kong Nexus participates in 105 GCFs on Mactan Island, and a methods training module refinement is given its fourth run in Bontoa. The Panchayat Visitation to the Chicago Nexus occasions reflection on the future of impact and demonstration in North America and on emerging images of the Global Servant Force. Reports on the power of the global film as an impact and authorization tool comes in as copies return from Africa and from across North America. Images for the GRA in Chicago in July begin to emerge. A proposal is written for an assembly drawing together the learnings from two decades of experiments in human development by a broad range of agencies including the ICA. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding the large images and refining the tools needed to catapult the Movement into a new orbit for Quarter IV and the coming year.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the Loudermilks complete four LENS seminars in Nairobi and one in Lagos. LENS is also scheduled with Royal Trust Company, one of Canada's largest banks. GSD strike forces move with strength in Asherton and Mill Shoals HDPs. Booher returns from European continental council. Campaign convergence takes practical form as the continent prepares to pull together behind North American 19 with impact, acceleration and Guardian support. The key contradiction lies in the arena of providing clear images to the continent that reveal urgency and give practical focus to engagement.

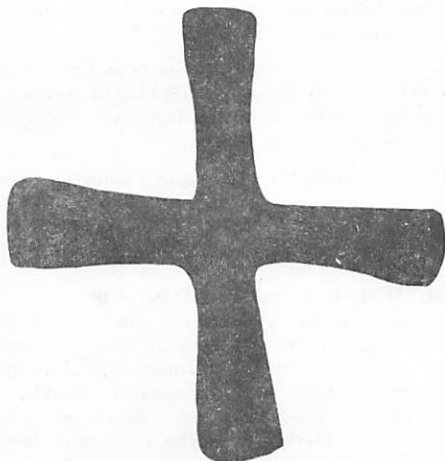
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports on the start of the audit in Chicago and the receipt of sufficient inkind carpet to do all the sixth floor halls. Hong Kong initiates the search for a new facility and mails out the February Order Ecumenical reports. Singapore moves ahead on the Malaysia audit and Brussels and India match up data for grant documentation. ICA general ledgers are being opened for 1979 at all locations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unclarity on the bottom line products for this quarter which skews operating priorities.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two CYFs with over 200 participants are orchestrated by youth cluster located in London and set up through the church—one through the Ursuline Convent School and one through Methodist clergy. Three Oxford students prepare to go to India; one has money in-hand.

Internal: House has week of sending out: Hamptons to India, Chris Mead to Academy and Don Cramer to France TM, Mike Rusher and Jeanette Fernandes to Guardians meeting, and Carol Butcher to Leapfrog Contest to raise money for India.

Contradiction: Setting up adequate system for polis coverage with TM. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Grampian Circuit and preparation in Peterhead Polis elicits excitement among local leadership. Turriff CYF produces twice the money expected plus great advocacy for future work.

Internal: Acceleration of polis coverage happens with return of Doug Allan from France campaign and presence of German student, Mike Ziegler.

Contradiction: Speeding up circuiting without flying out of orbit. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'R GWAITH HDP

External: Economic breakthrough continues with two and a half hour management board meeting, visit from WDA finance accountant and capital funding trip to London. Local people participate in judo demonstration and Garnant TM workshop. Village shakes off winter doldrums with first planning meeting for the summer carnival.

Internal: House celebrates the stay of Petra and Michael, German students, with Black Forest Gareaux and homemade elderflower wine.

"Listen now, you rebels. Shall we make water gush from this rock for you?" And Moses raised his hand and struck the rock twice with the branch; water gushed in abundance, and the community drank and their cattle too.

Numbers 20: 10b—11

Contradiction: Transforming good ideas in the social and human arenas into victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Lucy Smith is sent out with four metro colleagues from three metros to continental Guardians Meeting.

Internal: House participates in parish church's (St. James) Centenary Thanksgiving service, with Guardian, Bishop Wickham, giving the address.

Contradiction: Seeing through methods to completing U.K. polis coverage by Week 9. (Wk. 2)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: The Diamond Hexagon Campaign completes 13 TMs in second week of campaign with four circuit teams on the road. Circuit teams are reconfigured at a debriefing session in the field at the end of each week.

Internal: Maximum flexibility in maneuvering is maintained by expanding the command post to seven nations and by dividing two weeks into three weeks.

Contradiction: Forging ahead in triple acceleration and guaranteeing models applicable to next nation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The roof is on the industrial building. Work camp from St. George's International School arrives to paint the exterior and interior. Spain research trek returns with valuable information for first entry.

Internal: Ecclesiola is high point of the week in Termine with five around the table.

Contradiction: Keeping the whole battle in perspective while raising the flag on one stubborn hill. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Panchayat arrives on heels of Wedge team. Three major maneuvers focus Lagos State frame, NICA registration, and immigration regularization into a single thrust, culminating in Panchayat reception. This features prominent Guardian's terrace, studded with American Ambassador, Canadian High Commissioner, two Lagos State Ministry Officials, three Ijede residents, and a dozen managing directors of Nigerian companies. Global film profoundly impacts entire group, and comment is heard, "We've got to show this to the village." One-two punch of depth reflection (Panchayat) and keystone planning (Wedge) breaks auxiliary loose to focus on "stake of gold" studded with village industrial park jewel. Thirty shadows spring up around auxiliary as House assigns three to each staff.

Internal: Maneuver 34-34 is dramatized by transformation of collegium room and kitchen from bare-windowed, concrete-floored, pink-walled space into gleaming gold rooms with black tile floors and fine blue curtains.

Contradiction: Actuating the quarter's maneuvers rather than favorite druthers. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Development receives extra impetus from Third World troops and Management Centrum.

Internal: House turns inside out for indoor spring fever picnic. Week II conversations allow exciting reflection on Belgium.

Contradiction: Reducing task to that which is immediate and handleable. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Twenty-five percent of village comes to TM in stronghold. A second French training session at House with Paris troops continues House interchange.

Internal: Morning with Global Operations Centrum clarifies issues and victory circle for House.

Contradiction: Polishing a stronghold while setting up two more. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House spends three hours with head of Overijssel Province Director of CRM (National Cultural Ministry) in a collegial call (he has been to Inyan Wakagapi) which helps reflection on strategy and story relative to the powers that be in the Netherlands. House meets with cultural council in Overijssel to plan March 15th meeting to introduce local officials from across province to DD. House discovers over 100 local DD contacts to send newsletters to.

Internal: House hosts young couples on their way (in June) to Kamweleni for six months.

Contradiction: Creating authorization milieu for program which enables creating programmatic milieu for authorization. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: While continental maneuvers are focused on France, four *Gemeindeforums* happen around the edges and five regional colleagues phone in excitedly to report they will attend Brussels Board of Guidance meeting.

Internal: Jackie Cress arrives en route to U.S.A. from month in India just in time to plan quarter's Emerging Generation curriculum and take part in candlelight dinner to send Hanneral out to Academy.

Contradiction: Keeping one hand doing the steady beat of daily Town Meetings while the other hand creates the different rhythm of continental maneuver set-up in scattered polises. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The great week of launching the Project into a new orbit is highlighted with the community Quarter IV planning meeting, using Town Meeting methods, and a whirlwind of Development letters and materials and appointments using up all colleagues' energy.

Internal: House sends out Ian Clark and two *darmstadt* students as they finish sojourn, Maria Maguire on three-week assignment to India, Berthold S. to Brussels Guardian Meeting and Hans Peter Brunner to Academy.

Contradiction: Taking the community shadows into the light. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Monthly Bilharzia eradication campaign is kicked off with every family visited, and three more water taps put in. A new kiln for the brick factory is completed. Twenty contributors and Guardians are hosted in Cairo and shown the Global Film, a fine evening.

Internal: Development Systems team, Panchayat visitation and the Dettmans, Guardians from Minnesota, pass through and bring with them many gifts, including a copy of the global film.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum in the midst of manipulating the red tape for usage of land for desert reclamation, brick factory, and new building site. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Authorization and Development calls with Wedge team move House into new orbit of funding, the results of which look promising. Project keystones workshop reveals consensus regarding the needed miracles of KHDP. Assistant Commissioner puts letter into hands of Brussels Nexus that holds up ICA as having most effective development projects of any non-governmental body in Kenya.

Internal: Continental Council: Africa brings together representatives from all four Human Development Projects and three beachheads (areas) of the continent.

Contradiction: Raising funds and new leadership as House moves in all-out effort to bring off HDTS and at the same time to keep the momentum in the Project. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Village leaders are sitting waiting for meeting to start when auxiliary staff arrive in village. Visit ends with one of village teachers asking, "When will you return?" Presentation at Calcutta Rotary Rural Development Committee meeting opens doorway to many companies and organizations.

Internal: Area Guardian from Calcutta accompanies ICA to village.

Contradiction: Broadening base of private sector support for the HDP. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: All centrums report milestones: Development's "1,000 dollar" club, research finishes fifth methods training module, operations Bontoa impact trek and Australia CMA command post, and management's general ledger system set-up.

Internal: House holds coordination meeting Week II while hosting interchanges in development, research, operations, management, Projects and area.

Contradiction: Structuring the troops now for a future war that will intensify by combining field sensitivity, immediate nitty-gritty and effective regular actuation systems. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: The first methods module comes to completion with 30 guild and stake leaders in regular attendance. The State Fishermen's co-op delivers a new four-wheel drive truck to the livestock guild and the village takes first steps toward forming a village company. The new handicraft factory is completed and is now ready for its grand opening. The health caretakers form the first St. John's ambulance unit in rural Sabah and the ICA proposal is presented to the Sabah Foundation for a comprehensive health program for the State.

Internal: Michael Francis is sent to join the faculty of the HDTS in the Philippines and House has a rousing ending with the first annual buffalo awards for excellence.

Contradiction: Releasing the delivery of chickens through the bewildering forms of the state government. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Successful approving of US\$12,000 on the Canadian grant releases US\$5,000 for global funds. A long-time advocate who is director of Nylex Australia and Nylex Malaysia director visit Project and symbolize the importance of their visit by bringing their wives. New and revised village newspaper, *Suara Sungai Lui*, goes to press only hours after the news of Veterinary Services invitation to the village on the 30th to come and get acquainted with cow, goat, and chicken programs available through the government. Fun preschool outing is held at the waterfall for 50 with games and food. Quilt class ladies get contract to crochet glass covers at a handsome profit. Physically fit Rich and Peter unload three and a half tons of in-kind cement in record time of ten minutes to the awe of driver and helper. Headman from Stake 1 dies and whole village participates in mourning and Muslim funeral.

Internal: Saturday night the whole House goes to nearby town famous for its sauteed beef to celebrate with Hans Peter Fuchs and Rajamohan before their departure for Chicago, Peter for Academy and Raja, a professional printer, to work in the nexus print shop for one year.

Contradiction: Enabling a government figure to release the reins on the future to the willing villagers. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Loans extended by Development bank make cumulative total of 26 boat motors since September. GCF total is eight now with total village leadership. Bubun Headman participates in Kuala Lumpur impact trek and authorization calls. North Sumatra University students and lecturers make 24-hour visit to Bubun. House participates in singing and weekly planning session and meets last minute demand for Bubun display at Medan fair, 40 days exhibition.

Internal: Gail returns from impact treks in Kuala Lumpur and Bontoa, and Chairul leaves for HDTs: Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Releasing internal structures in the face of the need for constant care and travel to move implementation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Key businesswoman in Ujung Pandang inkind four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Return of most troops allows possibility of low-key mind-blowing reporting and visioning on breakloose across zone.

Contradiction: Accelerating momentum occasioned by the breakloose while keeping one eye on the necessary future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Forty businessmen gather for lunch at five-star hotel to look at future of ICA in Philippines and to receive thanks for their past support. Development presents 20 new proposals. Levi Strauss delivers 100 pairs of Levis and T-shirts for the 50 Filipino "blue shirts". An order for villages to produce new craft item for export is received after site visit to Sudtonggan. Citibank, pleased with their Rock Industry investment, now offers to buy jeep for transportation system of five Mactan villages.

Internal: House has end of Development trek celebration with brunch at local restaurant.

Contradiction: Staging the next leap now, with victory for the year in hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House receives Week 12 commitments from Taipei companies totaling over NT\$100,000 (US\$2,800), and interest from several companies in long-range support of Human Development Projects in Taiwan.

Internal: Development trek from Hong Kong Nexus is extended into Week 13.

Contradiction: Planning Quarter IV. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan Island assembly capping the 222 forums is held in city's plaza with 200 representatives of 100 communities graced by mayor's encouraging speech. Cluster starts new rattan industry in one village and grades another main road in another with new cluster doctor acquired to serve all four villages. Internal: Yoshi Koshiyama celebrates his 21st birthday by quoting JFK and declaring his decision to serve others. Molly Shaw's sister arrives for a two-week visit.

Contradiction: Turning the willingness of companies to release employees as volunteers into people on the road every day. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Village men work on re-installing and upgrading common grain mill equipment. Special task force in Seoul creates brochure reporting the work of the Korean HDPs. One preschool assistant teacher is secured.

Internal: House gains clarity on Jeju-do grid and Town Meeting targets in workshop that names sub-county capital cities and creates grid decor for collegium space.

Contradiction: Sustaining immediate action in the Project while concentrating energy on long-range strategy. (Wk. 2)

Internal: House celebrates decision to double the troop strength in Miami Region with assignment of Dennis and Amy Jennings.

Contradiction: Maneuvering for position for big push in September. (Wk. 2)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Nexus participates in Chicago's most interesting mayoral and aldermanic elections. North American Project directors' meeting plans for Guardians Consult and the Merry Month of May. Guardians Consult is highlighted by Ruth Wilson's talk on Mississippi: 200, Mr. Deth's presentation of drawings for Latin American HDPs and Andy Batchelor's decision to get sewing machines to Kinney HDP.

Internal: Nexus prepares for special, public events for the third week running, while a windstorm blows window glass and trash around cleaning efforts.

Contradiction: Moving now in different, wrenching ways with internal life to freight the nexus to GRA. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: One of the finest Area Councils is held at Chicago House with overall flow and preparation *par excellence*, and focus on May with tactics for concrete expenditure.

Internal: Fixing House roof becomes symbol of mundanity that is life, and along with other repairs, continues to keep House looking great.

Contradiction: Putting emphasis on catalyzing leadership toward the future. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Strongholds for Quarter IV are selected, maneuvers delineated, and first mailing piece designed.

Internal: Ecclesiola turns out to be a surprise maneuver to the local bowling alley, enabling metro teams to organize themselves for quick victory.

Contradiction: Seeing everything is done as one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: A circuit covers the entire region—2,000 miles through four states—producing a host committee of 12 mayors who will, with the ICA, endorse and host the Local Communities on the Move Conference to be held in Kinney June 1-3. A LENS seminar is held for the planners of the IBM corporation who plan for nine more.

Internal: Fifteen troopers from the Minneapolis Region attend the Area Council with representation from all three bi-metros.

Contradiction: Moving as one body in the midst of an overwhelming shower of potential and possibilities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Saturday foray to new saturation area—Missouri Valley—results in demand to get started with a series of TMs as soon as possible.

Internal: Jim Slotta and Mary Ann Wainwright offer different perspectives doing guest collegiums during week.

Contradiction: Doing the mission with troops available only Day I and Day II. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: While auxiliary are at Area Council in Chicago, community people complete the weekly *Voice* to go to the printer.

Internal: By visiting with colleagues, new forms of nutrition for better health and economy are discovered.

Contradiction: Getting people excited about and involved in the quarter's plan without overwhelming them. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Kinney/Great Scott Community Association (LEV) is incorporated, linking city and township. Extension holds vegetable garden workshop. Women's industry team models sample uniform for designer in Minneapolis. City Council gives go ahead to developer to do 13 units of senior citizen housing.

Internal: Auxiliary families enjoy area fish fry, dance and card party over weekend.

Contradiction: Re-engaging symbolic leadership of town. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Ticket sellers are commissioned for the regional

premiere of the global film at the "International Evening" on March 31.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat Visitation climaxed by 35 colleagues attending buffet and global catch-up.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the troops to do the work of the region. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Three more TMs in Louisville series (Parkhill neighborhood) host 120 participants and involve 18 metro troops in orchestrating and enabling. Development raises \$1,000 during a "non-Development week". House sends out Nancy Bain to Academy and recruits another person the night before Academy begins. Brochures go out for Bloomington GWF.

Internal: David Speicher returns to House from Minto Consult with reports of the depth corporate resolve of the Minto community.

Contradiction: Nailing down dates for 20 imminent events so House sees the space for the next 40 events yet to be set up for Quarter IV. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: The impact arsenal of CYF, GWF and global film explode awakening in Winchester, Kentucky, Hamilton, Ohio and Columbus, Ohio.

Internal: Final week of the quarter coincides with final test week for student cluster resulting in corporate sleeplessness and death ground engagement.

Contradiction: Expanding the local core group in every saturation stronghold to care for the breakloose in awakening. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Region shows HDP slide show to post TM guilds in three northern communities and sees global film at Regional Council.

Internal: House takes advantage of northern circuit to do cross-country skiing and celebrates life and death of Gregg Harris' father.

Contradiction: Setting the stage for the next major offensive. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: A \$1,000 grant from Cleveland Trust affirms saturation plan and is planned as leverage for the major corporations.

Internal: John Poole starts school at Cleveland State and envisions a university house.

Contradiction: Arranging energy in the appropriate fashion amidst all the possibilities. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: SUPER (Smithtownship Unity Planning Effort and Results) month concludes with CYF with 100 students at Commack South High School and GWF with key women, and new staff being trained at both events. Housing forum in Luisaida with 45 present is standing room only event.

Internal: House celebrates Justin and Delores Morrill's 25th wedding anniversary with eventful evening that pushes exploration of what that rite can be.

Contradiction: Designing the corporate strategy that creates an experiment, using fluid troops, that prepares House for the summer and next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: The fear of time-consuming task of creating the newsletter is turned into fascination as House discovers the writing is completed in one day and the mailing in an evening, which proves system works.

Internal: Kip and Janice May bring Conacaste and signs of possibility to the Pittsburgh Region through their slide show of the Consult and Project initiation.

Contradiction: Catalyzing momentum in the midst of intentional own-backyard isolationism. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Panchayat Visitation provides opportunity for contextualizing colleagues on global mission and missional force needs. Colleagues see Coggeshall's India slides on Saturday and global film on Sunday.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation ends in celebration with pizza and roller skating. Elaine Butcher is selected as senior class candidate for Recognition Week queen.

Contradiction: Grounding the fact that House is a part of a world-wide campaign, not a relative of one. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Regional Council becomes "bring your favorite dish and come for Saturday night at the movie" as 50 colleagues gather for fine report on Panchayat Visitation to Area San Francisco and the continents of NAME and Black Africa, as well as feasting and viewing the global film.

Internal: Collegiums are high points as House struggles with global thrusts and views morning TV talk show focusing on Ivy City.

Contradiction: Holding in tension quarterly planning while allowing appropriation of local significant events. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Snack Bar opens in Widen Gym, run by personnel from the Widen Youth Corps (CEYA). Contributions from two churches secure new portable toilets for the preschool.

Internal: Water runs where it is supposed to—in and out.

Contradiction: Carving out time for long-term planning and consensus building in the midst of doing the immediacies. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Regional colleagues display growing contextual and methodological skills in their leadership of Regional Council.

Internal: House is addressed by willingness of both old and new colleagues to be part of a regional advisory list for authorization and framing.

Contradiction: Discerning the Development framing contacts and steps that will release the larger monies from donors, corporations, and foundations. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: The Whitlock Family hosts two *Evenings with the Institute* on one day, a key authorization tactic for a potential church V.I.P. and a great recontext for old friends.

Internal: Team of two spends two days on the phone and then hits the road to pick up in-kind bounty for Area Council—from radishes to candles to colored newsprint to eggs.

Contradiction: Designing the corporate strategy that uses fluid troops to create an experimental quarter which prepares troops for the summer and next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Key visits strengthen bond to historical Church and consensus on plan for Miracle Month of May is reached at Area Council, allowing Project to be reborn.

Internal: Bishop Jim Mathews reaffirms role of ICA in relationship to world need for methods to build and demonstrate community.

Contradiction: Focusing energy of angry and frustrated tigers held at bay. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: The Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. is incorporated and local core group's taking responsibility triggers a turning point discussion of decision-making processes in Project meeting. The wood equity project makes its first sale with three more orders in. Meanwhile TMs sends House and metro people to the Lower Adirondacks and the city of Binghamton for six great events.

Internal: Collegiums start House brooding on possibilities for next quarter and visits from the Emerick family and Oscar Sperstad help celebrate the here and now of Charlotteville.

Contradiction: Visioning the future to invest the present with purpose and expectation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Four dates for TMs set in Brockton and Laconia strongholds. High school assigns metro student to Minto, Alaska out of careers program.

Internal: House celebrates Ahren Stock's first birthday and continues review of basic methods with charting method study.

Contradiction: Maintaining the intensity of the stronghold in the midst of planning regional and area councils. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Quarter IV battleplan is ready for implementation following exciting week of positioning: Secretary of State grant received and meeting with regional colleagues when send-out ritual includes the gift of a key to the new House.

Internal: Final countdown for Open House finds Youth laying the two rolls of new carpet found under melting snow in the backyard.

Contradiction: Shifting the context of Open House visitors from curious to committed in the face of a new quarter of saturation demands. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Systematic visits to women's organizations continue as GWF date comes closer. Development has a good week and decides to come back next week for more. Recruitment for the Academy and Guardians Consult keep the phone busy.

Internal: Reflections on Quarter III and its significance in terms of the urban contradictions release planning for Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating non-defensive style and story that elicits a yes. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: House sends one-third to open new saturation front in Sudbury while rest race against deadline for increase of postal rates to get newsletter out to over 1,500 Community Forum grads.

Internal: House celebrates closing of North Leeds saturation by seeing *Norma Rae*, a great film for local man revolutionaries.

Contradiction: Building the funding and authorization bases for new program thrusts without being rescued by bureaucrats' time design. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Development trips net \$1200 cash and \$30,000 in loan from a religious order. Saturation assists with 500-person event that came from Community Forum proposal. New weekly rhythm in LEDC office includes methods training. Adult education classes begin new sessions using *Alternatives* and *Campaign News* for conversations. *Voice* is produced and distributed, arranged by Youth editor, Humel LaPointe.

Internal: Permeation team locates three job offers over \$12,000, all four to six hours away and accepts one.

Contradiction: Giving priority time to critical proposal-writing in the maneuver plan. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: After working from 8 am to midnight for a week on completing construction on community store, it is inaugurated on Saturday, with the community hosting representatives of the NAA, the local priest, and an international magician.

Internal: Rod Worden returns from permeation in New York and Merci and Kaki Kerou are reassigned to Woburn Lawn.

Contradiction: Refocusing strongly in multiple arenas after a strong single focus on local economy. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Two local greenhouse employees chosen by the community start work on the construction at the four greenhouses and begin planting zucchini squash. The sewing industry workers receive salaries for work on school uniforms. Fourteen women attend a 36-hour first aid class two days a week. The GWF team arrives and plunges into preparations for the Forum in Santiago.

Internal: Participating in the home spruce up campaign by sector, the auxiliary digs the black muck out of their septic hole, nicknamed "The Dark Abyss".

Contradiction: Making long-range decisions which have significant consequences beyond the vision. (Wk. 13)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: The universe shifts as ITI team and GWF trek arrive. GWFs are held in Rio in the American community, in Bananeiras, in Rio Bonito with professional Brazilian women, in San Jose on the other side of the state of Rio and in Rio de Janeiro for working women. All courses unleash authorization, unveil the globality and methods of the ICA and open new avenues for upcoming GCF campaign. The community meeting after the GWF brings news from the globe to local residents and ends with spirited singing with more people present than ever before. ITI recruitment begins in earnest. The Pan American School Foundation gives donation of 49,000 cruzeiros (US\$2,200).

Internal: The local *fazenda* owner comes to the aid of Development team on his private road after biggest bridge is washed away.

Contradiction: Using missional energy to break the imaginal blocks of English and timing for the ITI in order to gain momentum for recruitment and Development. (Wk. 2)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Bellingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Search for viable transportation results in financial assistance from Dutch embassy, and a panorama of possible mini-buses, land rovers and jeeps, all with accompanying gifts, contradictions and unclear indicatives.

Internal: Internal-space workday causes 45 degree shift in location of front of the room, and rediscovery of the importance of ordering one's symbolic space for mission.

Contradiction: Continuing the long march of tactics towards objectives out of the vision of global needs. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Site selection is completed with a review of all 40 locations seen. Visits are made to the National Institute of Planning and *Accion Comunitaria*. Lima metro cadre holds celebration with 36 in attendance, and cadre core reaches consensus on Project site.

Internal: House receives visits by Joe Crocker, Rafael Davila, Phil Holmes and Pat Moriarty.

Contradiction: Completing the national frame: having found the right man, finding the person who can deliver an offer he can't refuse. (Wk. 2)

WEEK TWO

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Canadians say yes to the last half of US\$20,000 in Singapore. ESSO, Johnson Wax and BP join the "\$1,000 Club". Philip Morris, New York, grants \$10,000. Government authorization in Malaysia (Selangor State) and US (12 states preparing for state TM campaigns) opens doors to private sector funding. The key contradiction lies in the arena of incorporating helpful trends into a brand new motivating image every month.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports in-the-field research as the Hong Kong Nexus participates in 105 GCFs on Mactan Island, and a methods training module refinement is given its fourth run in Bontoa. The Panchayat Visitation to the Chicago Nexus occasions reflection on the future of impact and demonstration in North America and on emerging images of the Global Servant Force. Reports on the power of the global film as an impact and authorization tool comes in as copies return from Africa and from across North America. Images for the GRA in Chicago in July begin to emerge. A proposal is written for an assembly drawing together the learnings from two decades of experiments in human development by a broad range of agencies including the ICA. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding the large images and refining the tools needed to catapult the Movement into a new orbit for Quarter IV and the coming year.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Quarter IV is launched with Sixteenth Guardians Consult, largest yet, preceded by project director's meeting. Two of four LENS seminars with Minnesota Department of Transportation give opportunity to train new staff. Villagers lead impact treks in Indonesia while Australian CMA moves into two new states. Maharashtra Month participants are deeply excited by Nava Gram Prayas and are reluctant to return home. ECF in Indonesia reveals high interest by businessmen and request for more. The key contradiction lies in the arena of carefully placing troops to enable momentum to build for Quarter IV win.

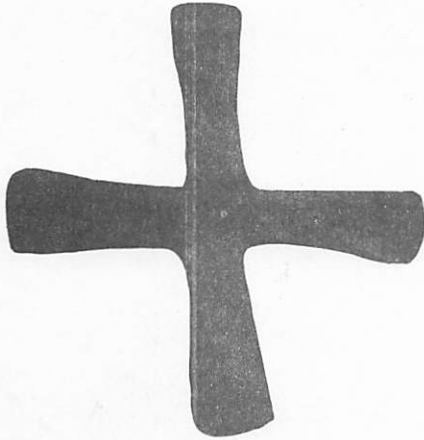
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Malaysian audit underway, Australian audit set for Weeks 6 and 7, Canadian audit set for Week 4. Chicago audit draws to a close Week 2. Singapore general ledgers are set up and operating. Hong Kong makes transfer of global funds through health refunds. Brussels pushes coordination of global travel. Chicago welcomes back colleagues from India and takes giant leap in sixth floor renovation for Guardians Consult. The breakthrough is that the centrum band has come alive over wrestling with the practical issues of global operations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the backlog of reporting which blocks any global financial picture.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two CYFs with over 200 participants are orchestrated by youth cluster located in London and set up through the church—one through the Ursuline Convent School and one through Methodist clergy. Three Oxford students prepare to go to India; one has money in-hand.

Internal: House has week of sending out: Hamptons to India, Chris Mead to Academy and Don Cramer to France TM, Mike Rusher and Jeanette Fernandes to Guardians meeting, and Carol Butcher to Leapfrog Contest to raise money for India.

Contradiction: Setting up adequate system for polis coverage with TM. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Breakloose of network polis phasing is symbolized by a "demo" set over the phone and several new appointments with community workers.

Internal: Ecclesiola colleagues journey with House to London for global film and quarter celebration.

Contradiction: Dealing with the immediacies from the thousand year vantage point. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Human development story impacts management board afresh after global film presentation and slide presentation in neighboring village clarifies the local understanding of THDP. Ninety strong TMs in nearby village puts local up front and intensifies expansion program. Visits from several government officials to Womens Industry Group accelerates marketing strategy.

Internal: Pat undergoes abdominal operation as David returns from France TM maneuver and House does major spring clean.

Contradiction: Gearing up for the quarter in the midst of internal readjustments. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Lucy Smith is sent out with four metro colleagues from three metros to continental Guardians Meeting.

Internal: House participates in parish church's (St. James) Centenary Thanksgiving service, with Guardian, Bishop Wickham, giving the address.

Contradiction: Seeing through methods to completing U.K. polis coverage by Week 9. (Wk. 2)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: The Diamond Hexagon Campaign completes 13TMs in second week of campaign with four circuit teams on the road. Circuit teams are reconfigured at a debriefing session in the field at the end of each week.

Internal: Maximum flexibility in maneuvering is maintained by expanding the command post to seven nations and by dividing two weeks into three weeks.

Contradiction: Forging ahead in triple acceleration and guaranteeing models applicable to next nation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Work camp from International School paints industrial building and impacts village with newsletter and celebration on Friday night. Nineteen work in the Rome Region this week on Project, development, authorization, and Spain report. Representatives of councils of eight global religious orders view global film and discuss future ways of working together.

Internal: Structures take real shape with input of fourteen extra troops and reflective conversations reach new levels of seriousness.

Contradiction: Dispelling the rumors in the village with concrete visible signs instead of one by one conversations. (Wk. 2)

Internal: Continental Council: Africa brings together representatives from all four Human Development Projects and three beachheads (areas) of the continent.

Contradiction: Raising funds and new leadership as House moves in all-out effort to bring off HDTS and at the same time to keep the momentum in the Project. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Village leaders are sitting waiting for meeting to start when auxiliary staff arrive in village. Visit ends with one of village teachers asking, "When will you return?" Presentation at Calcutta Rotary Rural Development Committee meeting opens doorway to many companies and organizations.

Internal: Area Guardian from Calcutta accompanies ICA to village.

Contradiction: Broadening base of private sector support for the HDP. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Nexus gets ready for Panchayat visit with Singapore colleagues eagerly participating in planning Movement event.

Internal: This is a week of visitors: Stephen Leenhouts, Stan Gibson, Robert and Shirley Porter, Danaraj Darlington, David Thomas, Scott Morris, James Chia—all experiencing the "Singapore Sling."

Contradiction: Pushing through the continuum versus "on the road" tension toward a one nexus focused on one zone mindset. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: The Sabah Foundation and Federal Medical Department approve proposal for a comprehensive health plan for the state using GCF, and two ICA auxiliary at premium salaries. Sabah Rotan has agreed to sub-continent commissions to employ 20 more in the village handicraft industry. The materials to build the chicken industry's nurseries arrive, thus beginning a joint venture with the government.

Internal: House Retreat molds a spirit of corporateness amidst building next quarter's maneuvers.

Contradiction: Creating the structures that will train the marginally involved villagers in order to get all tasks done. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Successful approving of US\$12,000 on the Canadian grant releases US\$5,000 for global funds. A long-time advocate who is director of Nylex Australia and Nylex Malaysia director visit Project and symbolize the importance of their visit by bringing their wives. New and revised village newspaper, *Suara Sungai Lui*, goes to press only hours after the news of Veterinary Services invitation to the village on the 30th to come and get acquainted with cow, goat, and chicken programs available through the government. Fun preschool outing is held at the waterfall for 50 with games and food. Quilt class ladies get contract to crochet glass covers at a handsome profit. Physically fit Rich and Peter unload three and a half tons of ink in cement in record time of ten minutes to the awe of driver and helper. Headman from Stake I dies and whole village participates in mourning and Muslim funeral.

Internal: Saturday night the whole House goes to nearby town famous for its sauteed beef to celebrate with Hans Peter Fuchs and Rajamohan before their departure for Chicago, Peter for Academy and Raja, a professional printer, to work in the nexus print shop for one year.

Contradiction: Enabling a government figure to release the reins on the future to the willing villagers. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Loans extended by Development bank make cumulative total of 26 boat motors since September. GCF total is eight now with total village leadership. Bubun Headman participates in Kuala Lumpur impact trek and authorization calls. North Sumatra University students and lecturers make 24-hour visit to Bubun. House participates in singing and weekly planning session and meets last minute demand for Bubun display at Medan fair, 40 days exhibition.

Internal: Gail returns from impact treks in Kuala Lumpur and Bontoa, and Chairul leaves for HDTS: Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Releasing internal structures in the face of the need for constant care and travel to move implementation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Key businesswoman in Ujung Pandang in kinds four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Entire House attends mosque for Mauhid, celebration of Mohammed's birthday.

Contradiction: Objectifying land ownership situation to release economic paralysis. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Two Nexus personnel participate in 105 GCFs in five days on Mactan Island.

Internal: Return of most troops allows possibility of low-key mind-blowing reporting and visioning on break loose across zone.

Contradiction: Accelerating momentum occasioned by the break loose while keeping one eye on the necessary future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Kowloon Roundtable installs new steel playground equipment in Nam Wai childrens' playground. House goes into first week of painting Hong Kong yellow with five forums and two on the line ready to go with eight weeks to set up more. In midst of GCF set-up, House receives request to do an RS-1. Electronics factory employees decide to lower pay scales slightly to put company books from red to black.

External: Guardian meeting in Taipei discusses Hai Ou's future economic development. Crabs and prawn fry are sold with US\$3,000 profit.

Internal: House celebrates with dinner and a movie in Kaohsiung as quarter planning recreates House structure.

Contradiction: Building models that allow new construction and business expansion to be funded. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Forty businessmen gather for lunch at five-star hotel to look at future of ICA in Philippines and to receive thanks for their past support. Development presents 20 new proposals. Levi Strauss delivers 100 pairs of Levis and T-shirts for the 50 Filipino "blue shirts". An order for villages to produce new craft item for export is received after site visit to Sudtonggan. Citibank, pleased with their Rock Industry investment, now offers to buy jeep for transportation system of five Mactan villages.

Internal: House has end of Development trek celebration with brunch at local restaurant.

Contradiction: Staging the next leap now, with victory for the year in hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Area Hong Kong development exceeds 1977-78 income in banked and committed money for 1978-79 in Taiwan. Cultural affairs program is held in Hsin Chu for Lions Club, bringing to half the 16 counties now covered.

Internal: U.S. military exchange closes with departure of over 1,000 Americans from Taiwan in past few days.

Contradiction: Completing the Quarter IV plan. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan Island assembly capping the 222 forums is held in city's plaza with 200 representatives of 100 communities graced by mayor's encouraging speech. Cluster starts new rattan industry in one village and grades another main road in another with new cluster doctor acquired to serve all four villages. New Cebu House goes on marathon building schedule to make April 1st HDTS opening.

Internal: House sends out Tony Elizondo and Efren Casquejo (a "Blue Shirt") to Davao as part of the Langub Cluster site selection team and welcomes Gordon Harper and Atach, from Bontoa HDP, for HDTS.

Contradiction: Encouraging company volunteers to take personal risk of doing April, May, and June maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Wedge team makes authorization calls around the two Korean Projects and strategizes for the future. Grain mill equipment is secured, 2,000 new chicks arrive for poultry farm, and 54 bee hives are installed.

Internal: House Church is super special with area prior and Neil Vance who visit in village and talk significantly with provincial Vice-Governor and Saemaul Section Chief.

External: Preschool opens, 8:00 to 3:00 five days a week, with 17 students and four full-time staff. State licensing inspector comments, "This is the fastest licensing process I've ever been involved in and with all those calls from Representative Duffy's office, you've really got strong support."

Internal: Visiting Redlands youth group joins House, after a hard day's work, in evening of games and relaxation.

Internal: First ecclesiola studying John Dunne's books finds House eager to get started and looking for "passing over" songs.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to re-excite TM communities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Denton holds core group meeting and Ponder High School holds CYF with 60 students making five events held, four more scheduled and six others possible in the Denton stronghold. House sends out Dane Adkinson to the Guardians Consult.

Internal: House welcomes two colleagues from Indiahoma as CYF facilitators and Wanda Holcombe from Australia.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to the continuing engagement of awakened individuals and stronghold communities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Three TMs, two CYFs and 24 planning meetings are held and 21 more TMs and two CYFs scheduled. House sends Ruth Wilson, Director of Governor's Office of Citizen Participation, and William Bell, Pace resident, to Guardians Consult.

Internal: House types, types, types over 5,000 names for state assembly mailing list.

Contradiction: Coordinating troops for state assembly prep, set up of last two Planning and Development Districts, development and coverage of present PODs within the time frame. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

Internal: A fine House Church welcomes Dennis and Amy Jennings and acquaints them with local colleagues.

Coordination of all data from Project Directors' meeting, Guardians Consult and Area Councils is begun for nexus collegiums on Quarter IV mobilization.

Internal: Celebration of season of Holy Week includes reflective exercise in transposing the Seven Last Words during Day I on Good Friday.

Contradiction: Maintaining new quarter momentum when models are still being prepared. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: One of the finest Area Councils is held at Chicago House with overall flow and preparation *par excellence*, and focus on May with tactics for concrete expenditure.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: First TM program Development check arrives. House re-strategizes and begins the three-week win with more than 50 plus small wins.

Internal: Area Council shifts gears and gives new images for strongholds, positioning and HDP participation in Quarter IV.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. Cambridge Town Meeting, Binghamton Town Meeting assembly and Albany Metro debriefing wind up quarter's Town Meeting campaign with two clusters of events held and one Assembly yet to go.

Internal: Looking ahead to next quarter through collegiums on "Ten Considerations in Community Reformulation" and quarter vision enables nonchalance with core and releases their creativity.

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House launches regular colleague engagement structure and discovers new inroads colleagues have made into local and wider network.

Internal: Permeation team locates three job offers over \$12,000, all four to six hours away and accepts one.

Contradiction: Giving priority time to critical proposal-writing in the maneuver plan. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Sector meetings decide on local clean up and meeting to make plans for May village festival. Cano Negro HDP participates in Caracas flea market with sheet booth.

Internal: Global GWF team arrives and intensifies recruitment of GWF and LENS.

Contradiction: Coordinating with troops in several places on different fronts. (Wk. 3)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Local bakers make embassy visits with a proposal for a new building which would permit doubling of production. Mr. Dethe, Indian architect, impacts village with decision, dedication, and deeds in seven days of visits, sketches, presentations, and presence as community plan consensus is formulated. Sol's showcase status is established with visit of ITT board member from New York.

Internal: House experiments with afternoon Common Meal, Retreat, planning council, new House teams and experiences an early first fall frost to mark turn of quarter.

Contradiction: Organizing logistics, decisions and catalytic tactics to meet concrete critical opportunities. (Wk. 3)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Community meeting focuses on what needs to be done in the HDP before June's first year anniversary, seeing improved roads and electricity as indicatives. A new bridge is built, allowing bus transportation to enter and leave the community. Agriculture receives donated seeds for the experimental station and the home garden program. MOBREAL, the government literacy program, agrees to sponsor and salary three local teachers for literacy, art, home gardening and nutritional cooking classes. ITI recruitment gains momentum with 10,000 cruzeiros scholarship money developed. A new Bananeiras song is created and sung at the community meeting. The preschool is moved to Program Center. Health Caretakers begin nutrition survey.

Internal: Mr. Dethe leaves for Brazilia and Chile after having completed the community master plan and community center model.

Contradiction: Enabling community leadership structurally. (Wk. 3)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Bellingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Support by IADB in Washington, D. C. wins the backing of IADB, Peru in a joint visit with the National Planning Institute, a critical authorizing body. San Vicente de Aspitia is selected for HDP, and first two village meetings are held. Ten arenas of Consult prep are determined at metro cadre meeting. Budgets and articles of incorporation are completed, continental letter is sent and Maryknoll agrees to permit temporary use of their tax-exempt status for funding.

Internal: House sends out Rafael Davila and Pat Moriarty and receives Addie and Elsa Batiza into the auxiliary.

Contradiction: Winning with the National Institute of Planning, on whom registration depends. (Wk. 3)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports: Bank of America (California) representative is taken on site visit of three TM towns plus Richgrove to check out possible \$60,000 grant. Asked if in light of Proposition 13 (voted tax cuts) the grant should go to the closed libraries or ICA, local TM resident responds, "ICA—anything else would be a bandaid." Stan Gibson returns to Chicago and reports the "framing is funding" as seen in Kenya and Indonesia government participation in total program. Singapore reports \$30,000 from USAID for Bubun and Bontoa. In great day of quarter planning down to the daily details, Chicago centrum finds the way to do 222 a month plus extraordinary maneuvers towards "financial evenness", i.e. 90 day current. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discovering how in everything done public image is an integral part of the ongoing task of Development.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports five calls produce 100 prospects and practical support for Rio ITI. First draft report on five methods modules conducted in Australia, Indonesia and Malaysia is completed. Modules are scheduled in Richgrove, Kinney and Gibson. Letters and reflections on the summer flood in, convincing centrum that everyone is indeed a researcher. The key contradiction lies in the arena of giving rapid form to Summer images without trying to run the program.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Quarter IV is launched with Sixteenth Guardians Consult, largest yet, preceded by project director's meeting. Two of four LENS seminars with Minnesota Department of Transportation give opportunity to train new staff. Villagers lead impact treks in Indonesia while Australian CMA moves into two new states. Maharastra Month participants are deeply excited by Nava Gram Prayas and are reluctant to return home. ECF in Indonesia reveals high interest by businessmen and request for more. The key contradiction lies in the arena of carefully placing troops to enable momentum to build for Quarter IV win.

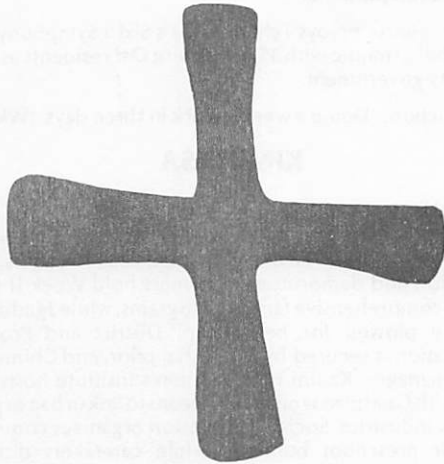
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: House has week of sending out: Hamptons to India, Chris Mead to Academy and Don Cramer to France TM, Mike Rusher and Jeanette Fernandes to Guardians meeting, and Carol Butcher to Leapfrog Contest to raise money for India.

Contradiction: Setting up adequate system for polis coverage with TM. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Scottish colleagues enable whirlwind weekend giving leadership to two TMs in polis coverage, and others participate in Isle of Dogs global film showing.

Internal: Whole House gathers for Good Friday Common Meal before dispersing for weekend of discontinuity.

Contradiction: Dancing the tension between regional empowerment and area maneuvers. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Human development story impacts management board afresh after global film presentation and slide presentation in neighboring village clarifies the local understanding of THDP. Ninety strong TMs in nearby village puts local up front and intensifies expansion program. Visits from several government officials to Womens Industry Group accelerates marketing strategy.

Internal: Pat undergoes abdominal operation as David returns from France TM maneuver and House does major spring clean.

Contradiction: Gearing up for the quarter in the midst of internal readjustments. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Lucy Smith is sent out with four metro colleagues from three metros to continental Guardians Meeting.

Internal: House participates in parish church's (St. James) Centenary Thanksgiving service, with Guardian, Bishop Wickham, giving the address.

Contradiction: Seeing through methods to completing U.K. polis coverage by Week 9. (Wk. 2)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: The Diamond Hexagon Campaign completes 13 TMs in second week of campaign with four circuit teams on the road. Circuit teams are reconfigured at a debriefing session in the field at the end of each week.

Internal: Maximum flexibility in maneuvering is maintained by expanding the command post to seven nations and by dividing two weeks into three weeks.

Contradiction: Forging ahead in triple acceleration and guaranteeing models applicable to next nation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Work camp from International School paints industrial building and impacts village with newsletter and celebration on Friday night. Nineteen work in the Rome Region this week on Project, development, authorization, and Spain report. Representatives of councils of eight global religious orders view global film and discuss future ways of working together.

Internal: Structures take real shape with input of fourteen extra troops and reflective conversations reach new levels of seriousness.

Contradiction: Dispelling the rumors in the village with concrete visible signs instead of one by one conversations. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: New sewing factory contracts for over 400 industrial uniforms for Nichemtex and Glaxo are secured, while grant is received from Canadian High Commission. Three unexpected visitors arrive from Punch (Nigeria) Newspapers and the Secretary to the Federal Military Government's office, testing new site visit construct. Two auxiliary attend reception for CIDA Director at First Secretary's house, Canadian High Commission.

Internal: First sojourner, Mr. Duvall Patrick, a Harvard grad on Michael Rockefeller fellowship, arrives looking for changed lives and a way to get his hands dirty.

Contradiction: Re-imaging House as generals rather than troops. (Wk. 4)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus rides to a whirlwind finish with the Diamond Hexagon Campaign for Town Meeting in France.

Internal: Week II conversations on the mythology of the 20th Century zero in on the relevancy of the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Using the advantage of the corporate to enable the task effectively. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Brussels House troops remain in France with the Diamond Hexagon Maneuvers to plan the next steps for the European TM campaign.

Internal: Week II conversations on the mythology of the 20th Century zero House in on the relevancy of the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Carrying the momentum from the France Town Meetings into the rest of Europe in the midst of a one week hiatus for Easter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House spends three hours with head of Overijssel Province Director of CRM (National Cultural Ministry) in a collegial call (he has been to Inyan Wakagapi) which helps reflection on strategy and story relative to the powers that be in the Netherlands. House meets with cultural council in Overijssel to plan March 15th meeting to introduce local officials from across province to DD. House discovers over 100 local DD contacts to send newsletters to.

Internal: House hosts young couples on their way (in June) to Kamweleni for six months.

Contradiction: Creating authorization milieu for program which enables creating programmatic milieu for authorization. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Maguire and Manfred come into House from North and West circuits, Berthold from Berlin, Tolman and Elizabeth from Paris. Then colleagues arrive, Frank from Stuttgart, Helma Kooijmans from Frankfurt and Garbi Lichblau from Vienna. Quarter IV plan is built in midst of Holy Week experienced as decisional acting outedness with spiritual assist of readings from exploits of Randle Patrick McMurphy.

Internal: Manfred and Blase visit city of Frankfurt Treasurer, who is House's landlord, and achieve authorization advance that is grounded in rent reduction of one-third.

Contradiction: Holding vacation time throughout Germany as an advantage to task, not an insurmountable obstacle. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The largest *Haustreffen* (House Town Meeting) occurs as 27 tenants in *Wrangelstrasse* meet to plan the future of their building, whose new owner, Willi Peik, is building a cooperative renovation model with assistance from the Project. The *Berlin Tages-Spiegel* prints an article about the Project, "The Momentum of the Invigorated Citizens Carries on into the Third Year", which results in an immediate donation of a microwave oven to the *Cafe zur Laterne*, as well as tremendous authorization potential.

Internal: House enjoys Tchaikowsky's Sixth Symphony at the Berlin Philharmonic with 15 Kreuzberg Ost residents as guests of the city government.

Contradiction: Doing a week's work in three days. (Wk. 3)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Monthly Bilharzia eradication campaign is kicked off with every family visited, and three more water taps put in. A new kiln for the brick factory is completed. Twenty contributors and Guardians are hosted in Cairo and shown the Global Film, a fine evening.

Internal: Development System team, Panchayat visitation and the Dettmans, Guardians from Minnesota, pass through and bring with them many gifts, including a copy of the global film.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum in the midst of manipulating the red tape for usage of land for desert reclamation, brick factory, and new building site. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Authorization and Development calls with Wedge team move House into new orbit of funding, the results of which look promising. Project keystones workshop reveals consensus regarding the needed miracles of KHDP. Assistant Commissioner puts letter into hands of Brussels Nexus that holds up ICA as having most effective development projects of any non-governmental body in Kenya.

Internal: Continental Council: Africa brings together representatives from all four Human Development Projects and three beachheads (areas) of the continent.

Contradiction: Raising funds and new leadership as House moves in all-out effort to bring off HDTS and at the same time to keep the momentum in the Project. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Village leaders are sitting waiting for meeting to start when auxiliary staff arrive in village. Visit ends with one of village teachers asking, "When will you return?" Presentation at Calcutta Rotary Rural Development Committee meeting opens doorway to many companies and organizations.

Internal: Area Guardian from Calcutta accompanies ICA to village.

Contradiction: Broadening base of private sector support for the HDP. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Nexus gets ready for Panchayat visit with Singapore colleagues eagerly participating in planning Movement event.

Internal: This is a week of visitors: Stephen Leenhouts, Stan Gibson, Robert and Shirley Porter, Danaraj Darlington, David Thomas, Scott Morris, James Chia—all experiencing the "Singapore Sling."

Contradiction: Pushing through the continuum versus "on the road" tension toward a one nexus focused on one zone mindset. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: University of Technology Malaysia students are brought to Serusup HDP by district officer as only exhibition of district's three demonstration villages. Serusup Handicrafts wins first, second and third prize at district fair. Datuk Harris, Chief Minister, compliments Project and project global market for economic programs. Village company is formed with Board of Directors of one representative from each guild and each space chosen at community meeting. Two international economics consultants learn about Project.

Internal: House undergoes massive renovation after receiving first full program check of Project.

Contradiction: Recreating neglected community space. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: The King of Malaysia dies on Thursday closing down everything for the rest of the week. Twenty-five women from Texas Instruments surprise all-male village auxiliary with a second visit to the village in more than a month and request a visit to the waterfall for a picnic. To help launch the three new women's industries, batik and solids are purchased for quilts, Thai silk for flowers, and crochet yard for glass covers. A surprise visit from the assistant district officer is rained out only to be holed-up in the pasar market.

Internal: Five of Kelly Michael's friends join House for ecclesiola, bringing the cultures represented to six.

Contradiction: Seizing the opportunity of apparent new advantage in political structures at the appropriate geographical point. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Loans extended by Development bank make cumulative total of 26 boat motors since September. GCF total is eight now with total village leadership. Bubun Headman participates in Kuala Lumpur impact trek and authorization calls. North Sumatra University students and lecturers make 24-hour visit to Bubun. House participates in singing and weekly planning session and meets last minute demand for Bubun display at Medan fair, 40 days exhibition.

Internal: Gail returns from impact treks in Kuala Lumpur and Bontoa, and Chairul leaves for HDTS: Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Releasing internal structures in the face of the need for constant care and travel to move implementation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Key businesswoman in Ujung Pandang in kinds four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Entire House attends mosque for Mauhid, celebration of Mohammed's birthday.

Contradiction: Objectifying land ownership situation to release economic paralysis. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: House receives 41,000 pesos cash just in time for April 6 opening of HDTS in Sudtonggan. Visiting Guardian, Dave Thomas (Seattle) orchestrates Hong Kong Town Meeting.

Internal: House experiences being crossroads with Guardian reports from China (Elliots from Denver), Maharashtra (Thomas from Seattle), and North-America-on-way-to-India (Wallace family, Los Angeles).

Contradiction: Turning facility hunt breakthrough leads into a facility. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Kowloon Roundtable installs new steel playground equipment in Nam Wai childrens' playground. House goes into first week of painting Hong Kong yellow with five forums and two on the line ready to go with eight weeks to set up more. In midst of GCF set-up, House receives request to do an RS-1. Electronics factory employees decide to lower pay scales slightly to put company books from red to black.

Internal: House send out Hezekiah Odyampo for staff at Sudtonggan HDTS, and Wong Ching On returns to Philippines after long awaited visa.

Contradiction: Focusing on major things, forgetting that it is the small things that bring off the victory. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Guardian meeting in Taipei discusses Hai Ou's future economic development. Crabs and prawn fry are sold with US\$3,000 profit.

Internal: House celebrates with dinner and a movie in Kaohsiung as quarter planning recreates House structure.

Contradiction: Building models that allow new construction and business expansion to be funded. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Forty businessmen gather for lunch at five-star hotel to look at future of ICA in Philippines and to receive thanks for their past support. Development presents 20 new proposals. Levi Strauss delivers 100 pairs of Levis and T-shirts for the 50

Filipino "blueshirts". An order for villages to produce new craft item for export is received after site visit to Sudtonggan. Citibank, pleased with their Rock Industry investment, now offers to buy jeep for transportation system of five Mactan villages.

Internal: House has end of Development trek celebration with brunch at local restaurant.

Contradiction: Staging the next leap now, with victory for the year in hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development brings in NT\$113,000 (US\$3,139) for the week.

Internal: David Thomas, Seattle Guardian, visits Taipei on his return trip to USA from a month of Consults in India.

Contradiction: Intensifying all maneuver arenas simultaneously. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Phase II of the Cluster experiment begins with economic intensification maneuver, "Picking up Pesos", as guilds birthed during first phase are empowered by initiation of regular Tuesday night building meeting with 60 people showing up for first night in each of five villages. Cluster-wide meetings are held for ELC, health and village administrators. From 222 forums, each Project village chooses four other villages to work with as extension villages. Victories include finalizing three new industry buildings, first rattan furniture payroll and 32 workers signing up for new caning industry.

Internal: New staff configuration of all ICA staff sleeping in Sudtonggan maximizes troop power in launching in industry push and gives Project directors cross-cluster responsibilities.

Contradiction: Pushing individual, short-sighted outlook on industrial employment to comprehensive care of whole villages. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Mountain cluster begins to move as four community forums are held in two days in maneuver for HDTS recruitment and Consult preparation. Twenty-three troops from Langub walk 40 kilometers in two days to participate and lead those forums with a total participation of 408. Long-awaited water pump for accessible community water begins installation and pushes water 180 feet uphill. City engineer's office assigns truck to assist Langub Brick Factory and eight truckloads of adobe stone for the kiln are delivered in one day. Possibility of huge contracts for sewing draws closer as new export-minded buyer orders garments for samples.

Internal: Ken and Judy Hamje arrive to shake the mountain into action and walk over 100 kilometers doing set-up for forums.

Contradiction: Increasing momentum of Langub programs in midst of HDTS recruitment and turning over of the baton. (Wk. 2)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: One team sets up three Town Meetings in one week. Mitsubishi Oil announces a grant of \$2,500 for Town Meeting. Four more Japanese are recruited as part-time circuiters.

Internal: Toshi Shimura announces to his family after a one week visit that he wants to interrupt Zen Monk school to live at the ICA, learn English and see the world before returning to school.

Contradiction: Encouraging company volunteers to take personal risk of doing April, May, and June maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Wedge team makes authorization calls around the two Korean Projects and strategizes for the future. Grain mill equipment is secured, 2,000 new chicks arrive for poultry farm, and 54 bee hives are installed.

Internal: House Church is super special with area prior and Neil Vance who visit in village and talk significantly with provincial Vice-Governor and Saemaul Section Chief.

Contradiction: Creating an intentional swirl around Project signs that will compel the village to reach out, to expand the impact of the Project. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Extensive in-kind network is engaged from paint to Crown Beer in preparation for one year celebration at Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Law office permeator's income is boosted by more than half to monthly net of US\$1,650, exceeding total House budget by 25%.

Contradiction: Having only one free finger while three buttons need pushing. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Visit to county chief reveals abundant Project praise, \$6,000 commitment for village truck, assurances of phones and 20 new homes, and his intent to forward special report commending the Project to President Park this fall.

Internal: School enrollment of Park children contains outward-bound dimension as it involves three mile daily hike over the mountain.

Contradiction: Allowing Project celebration plans and needs to enhance rather than foreclose fullness of the multitude of spring tasks in a rural village. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Trek to Oita nets another winning combination with three more TMs set and five more possible as well as netting one more circuiter who is also an English student. House visits, with the help of another Jaycee TM grad, the Fukuoka chapter of the Jaycees. With so much on TM calendar, House moves the Okinawa trek to May.

Internal: Re-evaluation of Quarter IV maneuvers moves House into the new quarter with the added celebration of two birthdays.

Contradiction: Coordinating circuits, TM dates, and troops in golding Japan. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Development week nets new doors opened. Agatha Christie's *Death on the River Nile* captures in intrigue both House and colleagues in celebration of the quarter's Friday Evenings at the Institute (ecclesiola). Coffee shop conversation makes the evening into a real event. Mailings to two prefectures and a visit to the American Center for possible interpreters set quarter in motion for TM circuits.

Internal: Area prior comes for Development week, and young woman visits and requests to sojourn.

Contradiction: Recruiting volunteers for immediate task while implementing long range volunteer recruitment plan. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Development call to retired president of Hokkaido's largest corporation renders introductions to company, Chamber of Commerce and National Farmers' Co-Op for TM support.

Internal: Area priorship meets with House to brood through next phase of Oyubari HDP.

Contradiction: Creating the numerous events in Oyubari between now and the end of the summer. (Wk. 4)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: CMA with Jaycees in Sutherland Shire runs until almost midnight with enthusiastic group. The result is a new network is tapped, building momentum for the campaign.

Internal: Panchayat, Wedge team, Murrin Bridge crew and Zone Development converge on House bringing 23 to breakfast table.

Contradiction: Structurally guarding the singular focus of the week. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Momentum of region is high as South Australian Community Meeting campaign is launched and finding flexibility in doing short-term, four-week campaign. Ten meetings held in Week 13 are highlighted in a great meeting at Kingston.

Internal: Twelve additional troops swell House and first week celebration is spontaneous and relaxed fun.

Contradiction: Making the campaign a series of spirit maneuvers instead of one long campaign. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Victoria is GOLD! One hundred twelve Community Meetings are held, one in each shire with 601 total attendance. Five shires have already invited House back to conduct larger public meetings and evaluation targets seven shires to launch saturation. Borg-Warner and Alcoa request CMs in their company towns.

Internal: Final CM celebration is inked from first class local hotel engaging everyone from 4 to 66 years in a fantastic evening of feasting and dancing.

Contradiction: Marshalling and training the regional troops to do the next phase of the campaigns. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Sir John Crawford, advisor to World Bank and several countries' aid agencies, calls up to say he wants to visit Maliwada in September. New decor goes up to focus thrust on New South Wales as TM campaign comes closer. Colleagues say yes to helping Murrin Bridge HDP get ready for its one year celebration.

Internal: Banks returns from TM command post for two days of whirlwind authorization visits in Department of Health.

Contradiction: Getting health proposal money in for Murrin Bridge by end of March. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

Internal: House starts to work on upgrading decor with one more room painted and curtains being made.

Contradiction: Getting beyond the experience of marking time and holding between CMA campaigns. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: First picnic table comes off production line. Celebration of the first year is highlighted by three hour softball game and a gala disco on the tennis court. Proposal for wages in industries is written.

Internal: House sends out Voslers to USA and Olive to Nairobi.

Contradiction: Keeping all acts going while half the magicians disappear. (Wk. 3)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: On Election Day for the first legislature (*Nitijela*) of the separate Marshall Islands nation, stakes write the story of *The Present* (TM method), and Assumption High School TM finds an untapped potential in the youth.

Internal: House is pushed to think concretely about the future as summer decisions approach and the study of Dunne holds House over against both the corporate and the individual aspects of the decisions.

Contradiction: Leaping over the abyss without deciding to go down into it. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: In the economic arena, pig fence adds second feeding area and bakery negotiates with development bank. In the social arena, the first Salani T-shirts are sold and English class has new interest following skit presentation at guild celebration.

Internal: Auxiliary birthday spans both sides of island as auxiliary tries on new structures for size.

Contradiction: Shifting the story from "the future will be the same" to "I can change the future". (Wk. 4)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Area and Regional Councils provide spiritizing events in self-support models and song writing and refocus the task and troops in light of global demands.

Internal: Emerging Generation Quarter IV curriculum is designed, printed for area distribution, and initiated during Easter week with a trip to Sacramento to explore California history.

Contradiction: Giving new images for the edge of the Movement by engaging local colleagues in recreating the vision of what the campaigns are about. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Preschool opens, 8:00 to 3:00 five days a week, with 17 students and four full-time staff. State licensing inspector comments, "This is the fastest licensing process I've ever been involved in and with all those calls from Representative Duffy's office, you've really got strong support."

Internal: Visiting Redlands youth group joins House, after a hard day's work, in evening of games and relaxation.

Contradiction: Pushing aside activities and making time for comprehensive planning for Quarter IV. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: The globe comes to Cusick in the form of a researcher from CBS's *60 Minutes*. Cusick goes to the globe with three community persons off to Guardians Consult in Chicago. The community celebrates spring weather with a start on outdoor clean-up.

Internal: Three fine collegiums on destiny keep House thinking.

Contradiction: Moving forward while in the line of fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: CSA confirms contract with local agency for TMs in Central Seattle and Regional Council construct is designed and mailing sent.

Internal: Easter celebration climaxes week of returnings: Richmonds from area meeting, Bruce Robertson from Guardians Consult and David Thomas from India and global trip.

Contradiction: Designing the strategic maneuvers that will position the state frame. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Grassroots involvement forum is held with representatives from city agencies and council staffs. Four block meetings are set by grassroots task force. Five colleagues journey with House to Pisinemo and several participate in Richgrove workday.

Internal: Engagement is growing with 12 guests at ecclesiola, sending Ralph and Anne Castro to a year in Latin America.

Contradiction: Putting selves in coordination and training role to release more effective coverage. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House sends out Marion Emerson, Ruth Jefferies and Carla Reed to Guardians Consult in Chicago. County planner visited concerning doing 20 TMs in Maricopa County (Phoenix) says, "This is the best citizen involvement thing I've ever seen. Can I learn how to do them?" House tapes broadcast on TM and sees man in north Phoenix wearing Pisinemo T-shirt. House meets with the six Arizona Area Directors of the Department of Economic Security about doing 20 TMs in each of their areas this spring and gets enthusiastic yeses. Visit is made to head of Arizona Women's Commission and she signs up for demonstration GWF in late April. CYF at House for ten enables three new pedagogues to emerge.

Internal: Cortez family completes week of their sojourn and Von Boeck family moves in for a week's sojourn.

Contradiction: Shifting from riding the Town Meeting wagon to flying 747. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Construction work proceeds on melon farm and nursery as fence posts are put up and bath house poles go up.

Internal: A great Easter celebration begins with sunrise service and continues with a trip to two historical missions (early social demonstration projects by Franciscans).

Contradiction: Training full-time volunteers to be able to run with current programs. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Funds are raised for Guardian participation from Cusick and food is in kind for auxiliary.

Internal: Metro hosts colleagues from Cusick HDP and are moved to assist on needs there.

Contradiction: Breaking loose local participation and spiritual nurture in a time of aridity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Self-support victory is in sight as House lands full-time job with the manager-trainee program of Color Tile.

Internal: House participates in Passover celebration of Seder meal at Mexican Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and is addressed at the story which accompanies the Seder meal.

Contradiction: Maintaining awakenment momentum with entire House working full-time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Store employees attend Super Valu buyers' fair in Bismarck. Ace Hardware offices are visited in Chicago to market Trash Barro. New construction crew begins work and repairs park lands.

Internal: Elmer and Thelma Shelltrack participate in ecclesiola and bring new freshness and an awareness of universality of Dunne.

Contradiction: Giving the methods to follow through on directing the roles of the programs. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Laramie, Wyoming maneuver comes to a close with 70 attending the Assembly and writing concrete proposals. The two-week campaign is full with 18 events (one held several weeks before) and 489 total attendance. Colleagues from Boulder, Brighton, Evergreen and Denver assist in workshop leading, along with eight local workshop leaders and eight more local production people. Key is an enthusiastic core group willing to work hard.

Internal: House gets finances in order for April 15 deadline.

Contradiction: Maintaining spirit and corporateness in midst of scattered troops and tasks. (Wk. 3)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Ecclesiola seminary study on India and the Third World is brought to life by two guests who seem to be really concerned about the problems being faced there, and House relationships with them are made better.

Internal: The TV show, *The Muppets*, gives a better taste to the "bleughness" of envelopes as House spends a night doing a mailing to many colleagues.

Contradiction: Trying to watch the first and second rings, when all the action is in the third. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Regional newsletter is designed, printed and mailed to 400 people throughout British Columbia. Neats obtain 12-month visa amid much relief.

Internal: First ecclesiola of the quarter with whole House present promises "the time of our lives."

Contradiction: Building the screen for future quarter directions that hold timing, troops, training and terrain. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Even though many people are out of the village, participation continues full swing with house and public building signs being done, daily mail petition, hall painting, CETA proposal and community collegium. Leadership is emerging strongly.

Internal: Exhilarating report from George Howard upon his return from Guardians Consult helps widen context to encompass global collegiality and an awareness of victories elsewhere.

Contradiction: Synchronizing House's images of time with the informal seasonal time frame of the village to find unique approaches to getting long-term tactics done. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Mailing on forum programs is sent to 46 communities within an 80-mile radius of Saskatoon.

Internal: House and guests are refreshed by first Dunne study of new ecclesiola construct for the quarter.

Contradiction: Building momentum for the coming quarter in midst of unclarity on long-range implications of Secretary of State grant. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Three major meetings are set up for Environment Week. Community turns out for funeral of oldest resident who dies at age 91. George Fool Bear and Charles Lester visit from Inyan Wakagapi with Trash Barro and meet with Vogar men.

Internal: House moves ICA collegium room in order to free space for Vogar HDP office.

Contradiction: Holding village to dealing with its concerns through step-by-step action plans. (Wk. 4)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Deep in the Heart of Texas Maneuver results in seven events held and seven more scheduled. GWF with Houston Professional Women is set for May and GWF is scheduled for March 17th with 30 invited by core of colleagues who decide to push GWF. Seven possible LENS are uncovered in Pivotal City arenas.

Internal: David Rose is selected as National Merit Finalist with letter of commendation to his Guardians. Houston House youth host 20 friends for an evening cabaret and dance party. Larry Henschen creates opportunity to upgrade job by interplant transfer.

Contradiction: Choosing the key possibility in the midst of a near avalanche of possibilities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: EDA State Director, two Regional Planning District representatives, a private consultant and two architects work on the public market venture at a community meeting. EDA grants \$120,000 for the enterprise to start a new grocery store and revolving loan fund for the CDC. Three community meetings prepare for first year celebration May 5th. Landscape architect does sketches for Heritage Plaza.

Internal: House participates in experiencing the Easter pageant in the Wichita Mountains with 30,000 people.

Contradiction: Bringing home the fact that when the residents make a decision, it is up to them to carry the decision out. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Mrs. Alvarado makes 300 *bunelas* (pastry) to sell to small shops. House makes trip to San Antonio for sewing possibilities. Thirty more people sign up for trash pick up.

Internal: House participates in quarterly planning at New Orleans for Area Council.

Contradiction: Breaking loose necessary tools for operating day care center. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Roger is joined on the Tulsa maneuver circuits by Pat Whitsett to work on Tulsa school CYF framing.

Internal: Traditional (for OKC House) Easter House Church celebration is held complete with char-broiled salmon provided by Guardian family, and homemade bread.

Contradiction: Standing in the tension between the need for rapid set-up and the frustration that comes when no immediate results pop up as long-range framing authorization pulls attention. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Staff meets with Goals for Dallas chairman, Larry Shaw of City Hall, West Dallas Community Center directors and Dallas VISTA workers to explore Dallas cluster. Guardians meeting plans showing of the global film.

Internal: House welcomes Jerry and Letty Lyn Maloney for visit and celebrates the drama of Holy Week.

Contradiction: Covering geography, doing an urban probe and ensuring local HDP victory simultaneously. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Three TMs, two CYFs and 24 planning meetings are held and 21 more TMs and two CYFs scheduled. House sends Ruth Wilson, Director of Governor's Office of Citizen Participation, and William Bell, Pace resident, to Guardians Consult.

Internal: House types, types, types over 5,000 names for state assembly mailing list.

Contradiction: Coordinating troops for state assembly prep, set up of last two Planning and Development Districts, development and coverage of present PODs within the time frame. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Excited commitment is aroused among five academic humanists while training to give TM spins for portion of Louisiana CH grant.

Internal: Dorothy, Fred and Greg are sent out for Easter visits with their families after which key colleagues arrive for House Church and Clements' 25th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Cloning colleagues for Crescent City Concert set-up and state framing to pop the cork on 30 TMs and all of next year's funding by June 1979. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: After second attempt, Dundee, Mississippi TM is great event with good black/white participation, enhanced by William Bell's (of Pace) orchestration. In other parts of Mississippi, five TMs are held in North Central and Golden Triangle, including Greenville's second TM in two years with more than 100 in attendance. All 40 TMs for April are scheduled.

Internal: A week of remembering Holy Week, cutting flowers, planting tomatoes and putting together the first Mississippi newsletter.

Contradiction: Ensuring projected self-support is a reality. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Four-day Candler/Glenwood planning assembly representing 16 block clubs with 175 in attendance, ends with presentation of 31-page document and work day with commercial corner beautification and mural painted. Two are sent out to Guardians Consult. Columbia High School asks for May CYF.

Internal: Michele Meyers and her two children, neighborhood residents, begin month sojourn.

Contradiction: Determining the next strategic move relative to positioning for next year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Stakes meet at the Community Center and lay out ambitions. Stake beautification plans for three upcoming workdays and next phase of New Horizons Park is begun with large Saturday workday.

Internal: First ecclesiola of the quarter gets the foundation of the Wall of Wonder built and Saturday night flower arranging party transforms whole House.

Contradiction: Enabling possibility and creativity to be released on the other side of a "no" from HUD on water and sewerage. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Four CYFs and a training session for future youth leaders are major triumphs.

Internal: A fine House Church welcomes Dennis and Amy Jennings and acquaints them with local colleagues.

Contradiction: Stepping back to assess advantages and vulnerabilities so that planning for this quarter will get House into position for Quarter II. (Wk. 3)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Nexus representatives attend North American Area Councils. Minto Consult team and Maharashtra "monthers" return with fine reports. GRA phasing chart is prepared. Coordination of all data from Project Directors' meeting, Guardians Consult and Area Councils is begun for nexus collegiums on Quarter IV mobilization.

Internal: Celebration of season of Holy Week includes reflective exercise in transposing the Seven Last Words during Day I on Good Friday.

Contradiction: Maintaining new quarter momentum when models are still being prepared. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: One of the finest Area Councils is held at Chicago House with overall flow and preparation *par excellence*, and focus on May with tactics for concrete expenditure.

Internal: Fixing House roof becomes symbol of mundanity that is life, and along with other repairs, continues to keep House looking great.

Contradiction: Putting emphasis on catalyzing leadership toward the future. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: The launching of Quarter IV is seen by the presentation of the campaign war board and 1,100 names in four strongholds for the direct mail "Heart of America" campaign.

Internal: The planning methodology for Quarter IV culminates in the multicolored tracking chart, symbolic event chart and weekly "do-ment chart" all held on one warboard.

Contradiction: Maintaining the three campaigns throughout the Merry Month of May. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

Countdown begins for the Local Communities Conference in Kinney June 1-3 with a visit to the Upper Great Lakes Commission, a possible major sponsor. Two LENS seminars come off in grand style for the Department of Transportation in Minnesota.

Internal: Proper file facilities are procured to enable thorough care for the many events and people in the region.

Contradiction: Unblocking the massive need for paper and printing for the invitation and preparation of the Communities on the Move Conference. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Starting quarter maneuvers with visits to groups in St. Louis and research for new Mill Shoals industry.

Internal: Jim Fenton returns from India with story after story grounding experience of Third World.

Contradiction: Stating the death ground out of all the priorities for final quarter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Easter becomes a happening in Mill Shoals with recovery of traditional Easter egg hunt and first-ever interchurch sunrise service and breakfast.

Internal: McCabes return from Minto and Chicago in time to finish preparation for preschool opening.

Contradiction: Seeing the whole picture in the midst of many small demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Two new Guardian prospects emerge. One rewrites community corporation's \$24,000 proposal and submits it, while Minneapolis lawyer sets up a session of free legal advice for Kinney Custom Industries.

Internal: Eight House members, one friend, and a cat get away for the Easter Week II to in-kind resort cabins.

Contradiction: Ensuring that those who have decided to pick up leadership in the community are equipped with the methods to sustain them. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Ticket sellers are commissioned for the regional premiere of the global film at the "International Evening" on March 31.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat Visitation climaxed by 35 colleagues attending buffet and global catch-up.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the troops to do the work of the region. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: DePauw University in Greencastle decides to send team of 35 students and professionals to Conacaste for January semester and offers to do the irrigation system. Lafayette cadre builds missional plan for Quarter IV while Indianapolis cadre does course adjustment to ensure covering all 14 Global Priorities.

Internal: House experiences discontinuity of fast day, followed by Easter celebrations with extended family and cadre colleagues.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to delimit stronghold set-up without taking the pressure off each town to put up \$100. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Three high schools ask for CYFs and two towns ask for youth/adult forums following regional CYF where 11 high schools send five delegates each.

Internal: Jay Antenen, Jr. reports on methodological breakthroughs in India replication at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Journeying TM communities toward HDP-type activities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: House kicks off the quarter with a CYF in Madison Heights involving 150 students from three high schools and a key Town Meeting in the Bay City stronghold attended by economic, political and cultural authorization.

Internal: House holds first rotating Saturday morning ecclesiola at Guardian's home to enable region to prepare for Global Research Assembly.

Contradiction: Operating out of convenience rather than missional need. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The Wausion Waltz continues as, at an exciting meeting with two of the key people for the assembly, the date is set, a letter is signed, and practical arrangements are made.

Internal: Team meetings provide reflection on the function and role of teams as sustaining dynamics.

Contradiction: Standing present to the drama of Holy Week while withstanding the hurricane winds of external events. (Wk. 4)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: First regional meeting of quarter is held in New Jersey. Swirl of saturation set-up appointments positions House for rapid wins. Three-year acquaintance expresses interest in progress of work.

Internal: Permeators report on job upgrade and applications for international employment looking ahead to next year's assignments.

Contradiction: Solidifying corporate designs enough to allow the regional initiative to bloom. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Many weeks of cultivation come to fruition with two dates set—the second being for four communities.

Internal: House celebrates victories with spontaneous consumption of ice cream "wednesdaes" and spontaneous individual performances.

Contradiction: Dealing with contradictory claims on time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: In the midst of Area Council, Area Chicago staff arrives to lead Glens Falls assembly and Buffalo TM set-up training event.

Internal: Travel to Area Council in time for Friday evening start calls for pulling out all the stops . . . and winning.

Contradiction: Building the comprehensive engagement screen which will care for all colleagues. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Regional strategizing and Ivy City "to do's" for next six months are celebrated as the four abandoned cars long adorning the community center grounds are finally ticketed and towed away.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Spring brings new life to Widen as the old steam shovel is cleared of trees and shrubs, a trip to Maryland initiates mining drill bit sharpening industry, Widen Wood Workers Association negotiates four more pallet contracts, and architects from University of West Virginia, Morgan Town, continue to make landscape and land use plans for Widen.

Internal: The Yost family arrives at airport in time to send off the Stovers, Rochmat Djatmiko and Denise Stanley to Area Council.

Contradiction: Creating set-up time for future winning while being consumed by duty. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Development call highlights include: "I can help you generate money," "I can help you on the plan for Town Meetings for Philadelphia," and "Here is my nominal gift of \$200."

Internal: The Dunne study in first ecclesiola of this quarter becomes a striking overview of the whole quarter's probable spirit journey.

Contradiction: Transforming sporadic interest into concrete engagement for saturation and Human Development Projects. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Area Council focuses the attention of all troops on the Merry Month of May and the decision to ensure the HDPs will be ready for anyone to visit by June.

Internal: Daily Office prayers indicate corporate decision to breathe new life into Order structures and liturgy.

Contradiction: Solidifying corporate design enough to allow the regional initiative to bloom. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Fifteen towns people attend Quarter IV congress and give permission to move forward and "unleash the tigers," uncovering the divisions while demonstrating that people have the ability to work together. A visit from Mr. Dethé of Chandigarh, India and his presence at the congress demonstrate globality.

Internal: Two auxiliary go to Guardians Consult in Chicago as rest of House gets impacted by the movie, *The Deer Hunter*.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. Cambridge Town Meeting, Binghamton Town Meeting assembly and Albany Metro debriefing wind up quarter's Town Meeting campaign with two clusters of events held and one Assembly yet to go.

Internal: Looking ahead to next quarter through collegiums on "Ten Considerations in Community Reformulation" and quarter vision enables nonchalance with core and releases their creativity.

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House launches regular colleague engagement structure and discovers new inroads colleagues have made into local and wider network.

Internal: House structures and decors itself for new quarter featuring the "Merry Month of May."

Contradiction: Maintaining campaign momentum during Holy Week and building adequate backup systems for Starks intensification month. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Twenty-one attend Saturday Open House for wine and cheese (in kind), tour of classy national offices and premiere of global film. Many guests are a surprise, providing new openings for funding urban probe and Movemental collegiality.

Internal: House celebrates completion of one maneuver and spends week breaking ground for new internal and external designs and maneuver configurations.

Contradiction: "Operationalizing" or putting wheels under vision of local renewed community in Quebec in the short period of time remaining. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: GWF in Halton County and Toronto County is confirmed and strengthened through planning, visitation and mailing. Visits to Church leadership continues work on avenue of support and engagement. Three Guardians participate in Guardians Consult in Chicago.

Internal: The central location of Toronto makes House once again the Wayside Inn for people from the east en route to the Guardians Consult.

Contradiction: Deciding victory and focus for Quarter IV that will tie into comprehensive strategy and give advantage in the future while wearing ballet shoes instead of army boots. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Twelve forum steering committees are initiated in Sudbury. House leads workshop with COPOH, a national organization of handicapped people.

Internal: Kenn lives off land in Sudbury and writes home for songbook.

Contradiction: Creating long-range strategy for deciding which funding and authorization vehicles to set up. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Development trips net \$1200 cash and \$30,000 in loan from a religious order. Saturation assists with 500-person event that came from Community Forum proposal. New weekly rhythm in LEDC office includes methods training. Adult education classes begin new sessions using *Alternatives* and *Campaign News* for conversations. *Voice* is produced and distributed, arranged by Youth editor, Humel LaPointe.

Internal: Permeation team locates three job offers over \$12,000, all four to six hours away and accepts one.

Contradiction: Giving priority time to critical proposal-writing in the maneuver plan. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Sector meetings decide on local clean up and meeting to make plans for May village festival. Cano Negro HDP participates in Caracas flea market with sheet booth.

Internal: Global GWF team arrives and intensifies recruitment of GWF and LENS.

Contradiction: Coordinating with troops in several places on different fronts. (Wk. 3)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Local bakers make embassy visits with a proposal for a new building which would permit doubling of production. Mr. Dethé, Indian architect, impacts village with decision, dedication, and deeds in seven days of visits, sketches, presentations, and presence as community plan consensus is formulated. Sol's showcase status is established with visit of ITT board member from New York.

Internal: House experiments with afternoon Common Meal, Retreat, planning council, new House teams and experiences an early first fall frost to mark turn of quarter.

Contradiction: Organizing logistics, decisions and catalytic tactics to meet concrete critical opportunities. (Wk. 3)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Community meeting focuses on what needs to be done in the HDP before June's first year anniversary, seeing improved roads and electricity as indicatives. A new bridge is built, allowing bus transportation to enter and leave the community. Agriculture receives donated seeds for the experimental station and the home garden program. MOBRAL, the government literacy program, agrees to sponsor and salary three local teachers for literacy, art, home gardening and nutritional cooking classes. ITI recruitment gains momentum with 10,000 cruzeiros scholarship money developed. A new Bananeiras song is created and sung at the community meeting. The preschool is moved to Program Center. Health Caretakers begin nutrition survey.

Internal: Mr. Dethé leaves for Brazilia and Chile after having completed the community master plan and community center model.

Contradiction: Enabling community leadership structurally. (Wk. 3)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Bellingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Earth tremor disrupts global slideshow presentation to 150 residents of Azpitia, narrated by Lus Marina Aponte. Consult proposal is submitted to Maryknoll. Metro cadre grids Lima Area.

Internal: House writes quarter maneuvers, sets up internal life assignments, and hosts Castro family on brief visit en route to Rio ITI.

Contradiction: Unblocking speed of operation and public image of stability through locating office space, phone and transportation. (Wk. 4)

WEEK FOUR

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a Week I blitz with 37 corporations in Manila results in 41,500 pesos in-hand and new proposals for 250,000 pesos. Timely appointments produce positive response to receive proposals with both Xerox (in two USA locations) and Bell Canada in Montreal. Chicago Continental Patrol is intensely engaged in framing in and around the US 12 as a system is established to allow archival filing of original copies of news articles and advocacy letters using Hong Kong file adaptation to allow quick topical retrieval. The key contradiction lies in the arena of exposing advantages and turning them into breakopen maneuvers.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports five calls produce 100 prospects and practical support for Rio ITI. First draft report on five methods modules conducted in Australia, Indonesia and Malaysia is completed. Modules are scheduled in Richgrove, Kinney and Gibson. Letters and reflections on the summer flood in, convincing centrum that everyone is indeed a researcher. The key contradiction lies in the arena of giving rapid form to Summer images without trying to run the program.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Quarter IV is launched with Sixteenth Guardians Consult, largest yet, preceded by project director's meeting. Two of four LENS seminars with Minnesota Department of Transportation give opportunity to train new staff. Villagers lead impact treks in Indonesia while Australian CMA moves into two new states. Maharastra Month participants are deeply excited by Nava Gram Prayas and are reluctant to return home. ECF in Indonesia reveals high interest by businessmen and request for more. The key contradiction lies in the arena of carefully placing troops to enable momentum to build for Quarter IV win.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports new travel agent in Singapore signals new cost control emphasis. Brussels prepares ICA International Incorporation. Chicago receives 6,000 pounds of inkind paper and completes broad planning and stewing on Quarter IV. Advent of Superman theme in the print shop brings a flurry of activity and images. The breakthrough is in the arena of troop configurations as people move to new assignments for Quarter IV. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the unsymbolized beginning of the quarter relative to planning and reporting.
