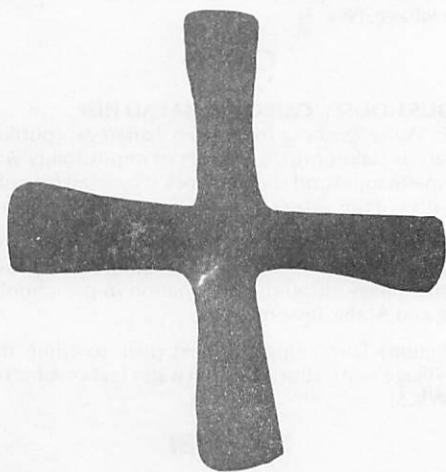


# THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON - ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Another full week of development appointments nets \$400 in hand and sets up a full week of appointments for week 4.

Internal: House delights in a first hand report of the Year of Australia at the Gun from Barry and Marge Oakley

Contradiction: Solidifying the working decisions before the unknown (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House visits colleagues with potential for two more seven-year pledges from grassroots support. Dr. August Vanistendael's report is given to key colleagues.

Internal: House visits the local community for two days and meets with returned missionaries from India, Rev. and Mrs. George More

Contradiction: Allowing regional colleagues to see that their role is crucial to caring practically for the region. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Management board takes major initiative in community building erection after a packed meeting. Women's industry agrees on officers, opens bank account and secures a contract for soft toys. Workday on Parish Hall grounds finds plenty of youngsters willing to help

Internal: Dazzling tennis at Wimbledon has entire village watching with auxiliary joining them at every break.

Contradiction: Sustaining those who care when dreams of an easy victory turn out to be illusions (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Three circuits are manned by colleagues completing 21 TMs in TM Jubilee Campaign. House mails 107 follow-up letters to interested people and 25 to autumn possibilities.

Internal: Collegium on personal part of *Wall of Wonder* grounds power of charting.

*I will give my covenant with you its full effect. Your old harvest shall I stow in store until you have to clear out the old to make room for the new. I will establish my Tabernacle among you and will not spurn you.*

Leviticus 26 10-11

Contradiction: Closing TM Jubilee Campaign in the midst of ongoing TMs with follow-up in the hands of regions so as not to lose advantages gained. (Wk. 13)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Troops type the French translation of Vanistendael's talk to Religious Order Superiors and finish the Town Meeting brochure translation into Spanish.

Internal: House hosts Sara and Mary Pinod and hears first hand report of "Spain over the past 25 years."

Contradiction: completing all that's required before discontinuity. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Project ships 100 chairs to storehouse in Atlanta. Development raises \$6,000. The farmers corporately buy cement for new barns. Ten families agree to workday and cost sharing on new waterline. Six tables are sold to architects in Rome.

Internal: House holds one day marathon quarter planning and celebrates.

Contradiction: Daring to plan the future boldly when it may be someone else's particular responsibility in a month. (Wk. 5)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: The Industry guns are more and more symbolized as Nurudeen, Mufutau and Salu pick up concrete responsibilities in Water systems, sewing factory and fishing team. Ijede Development Community and Unity League indicate their priorities for the year including two guest houses, football field, and refurbishing the Town Hall. Commissioner of Finance Olambiwanu drops by the say hello and is dazzled by the clean remodded auxiliary facility. Telapia Foundation announces 12-20 day visit beginning next week.

Internal: ITI mailing completed to 543 colleagues announcing new dates: 19 August through 8 September.

Contradiction: Living out a time design to enable real emphasis on the catalytic hosting dynamic in the Project. 5)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: \$6,000 gift enables Nexus to issue substantial July program checks.

Internal: Decorating and painting begin in earnest as House moves in some reclaimed furniture and begins looking for other items.

Contradiction: Living out of a motivating image for Quarter I. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Brussels Regional Council with global film and conversation on future strongholding caps a week of celebration and sendout of Paul Schrijnen to GRA and Manuel Guillot to Paris.

Internal: Quarter evaluation completed with collegium on stronghold learnings.

Contradiction: Keeping region going during summer to yield needed autumn harvest. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House shows the global film in Den Haag coupled with a report of a recent visit to Bayad by an agricultural expert. A lively discussion follows resulting in active interest in Dorpsdag as well as new funding possibilities and an entree to the International Agricultural Center for expertise.

Internal: Skeleton staff finds time to do things there was never time for during the year, such as revamping the file system to reflect new grid of the region.

Contradiction: Being the global consensus in preparation for the coming year while the global consensus is still getting forged. (Wk. 3)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Development team of Berthold Schwaiger and Connie Widyatama visit nine religious orders, mostly Benedictine, and report DM 8,000 working.

Internal: Blase, Astrid, and Martin fold and stuff 600 newsletters to spread the word of victory of the Great German Gamble.

Contradiction: Maintaining the ongoing mission while allowing maximum participation in the GRA. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The Children's Program starts full day with first payment from city of 18,700 DM. Housing program starts with a serie of tenants meetings and a new brochure attracting attention from all over Berlin.

Internal: The Berlin House is evacuated with Jutta going to Chicago, Berthold in the hospital for one week and Maria in Hamburg.

Contradiction: Shifting the role of ICA from the doing pole to the pole of spirit care for the community while completing the Project. (Wk. 5)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Stakes break loose in wild Quarter IV celebration, gathering for finale at new primary school to see President

Kaunda welcoming KHDP staff to State House on television. Ministry of Health, World Health Organization and Roundtable gather at site of new Health Training Center for groundbreaking. The march toward Great '79 ITI begins with a blitz of Copperbelt and Malawi and registrations roll in.

Internal: All Farrars and Meg Wildhack go to GRA and Priors Council.

Contradiction: Visioning Zambia's future and keeping in step with the village. (Wk. 3)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water gushing forth from *hanafeyas* (public water taps) in all six stakes drowns images of impossibility while the first complete toilet and shower block is opened for public use in the center of the village.

Internal: Presence of the Greg Farley family of four necessitates creation of a dorm for children who begin to impact the village through participation in preschool lesson planning and Arabic lessons.

Contradiction: Discerning the next peak to climb that will beckon village motivation now that water is accessible to every home. (Wk. 5)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Project submits Barclays Bank Grant accounts to auditor. Businessmen submit first financial report of Kawangware Industries to Economic Commission. The site for the Community Center in Kabiro is cleared and leveled with 100 community participants engaged. Kawatex receives a new lamp shade order. Kawangware Industry managers spend nine hours and create plan for expenditure of AT International grant which is on its way. Comartka sends samples of baskets to London and Israel.

Internal: Project holds fantastic celebration following workday in Kabiro in collegium room with shishkabobs cooked on open jiko (charcoal fire) and local man screwdrivers (local brew and orange drink).

Contradiction: Coordinating area ground task and support systems that move through to major victory by October 1st. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Pump and pipes are delivered. Standard four classroom walls start going up. Stake leaders play role of auxiliary as forty work on pathways in spite of heavy rain.

Internal: Three day fast culminating in night watch intensifies missional demand.

Contradiction: Mobilizing community effectively with limited staff. (Wk. 12)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The second Nadlapur consult documentation is

completed in English and Telugu and is presented to the Vizir Sultan Tobacco Company (the adopting company). The consult catalyzes breakthroughs in the village which bring new vision for the future to Nadlapur. First reports from Division Strike Forces proclaim positive response in villages to DOOP (do your own project) modules being held in all 232 villages.

Internal: Nexus hosts Bombay Division Strike Force in between modules and gets first hand reports on module effectiveness.

Contradiction: Holding tension between local and global additional emphasis on centrum and areal priorities. (Wk. 4)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Evening with the Institute, including global film showing, hosts representatives from World Bank, AID, Rotary Club and Madangeer Community Development Group. Three roads are bricked in Sikror. Mr. Manmohan Singh, Rural Development Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce, sets Development appointments. Stake meeting is held. One man is sent to HDTs. Deputy Panchayat Raj Officer visits village.

Internal: Laxmi and Vinod Yadav join Sikror auxiliary.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of change to summer style and mood rather than being slowed down by it. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADIAPUR HDP

External: The Consult team presents its findings to the project sponsors, the Vizir Sultan Tobacco Company and to the village leaders whose immediate positive response during quarterly planning indicates the new mood and new decision of the village. Stake five consenses on and marks out the plots for its 31 new houses. Six villagers make the 50 km round trip to Sangareddy to attend the eye camp. 75 villagers come to stake meetings. Stakes four and five decide to collect contributions for bringing electricity to their stakes. The revitalized Education Guild meets and designs new imaginal education curricula for adult education classes. The Industrial Guild receives orders for 100 blankets through the VST Company.

Internal: Internal life restructuring is intentionalized with new global decor in the collegium room.

Contradiction: Moving into a catalytic role on all fronts. (Wk. 4)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTs which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: All centurms are represented in planning meeting.

Internal: Dinner with Guardian couple highlights year's end.

Contradiction: Appropriating the care provided by the structures of society. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Veterinary Department holds long awaited duck course on how to raise ducks. Health Caretakers finish eight weeks of training in first aid, home nursing, family planning, prevention of TB, malaria and parasites and teaching methods. First two chicks arrive from KPD to reimburse chicken industry for materials and construction. Two chickens houses near completion as chickens are about to out grow nurseries. Pricbore Trip cancelled second week in a row due to heavy rains.

Internal: Michael Francis arrives in Serusup with many stories from Philippines HDTs and cluster work.

Contradiction: Changing old images that tell you nothing can be done when it rains. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Two surprise visits stir excitement when a bus load of people from the Ministry of Agriculture walk through village stopping at houses to interview people about the progress achieved in Sungai Lui. RISDA, agricultural development agency, visits and offers the Pasar (market) a \$5,000 loan at 4% interest for expansion saying "you are the only village of your kind in this district with a market." Meanwhile, the Agricultural Committee is rushing to sell shares for tractor purchase before the month of fasting begins and searching for good banana and rice seeds for planting after the fasting month is completed. All is in order for the ICA Board of Directors Meeting held this week. Preschool uniforms of lavender with white shirts are being tailored with parents sharing half of the cost.

Internal: Ruthe Yost and Alice Wright depart for Chicago.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with Town Meeting at expansionary speed and dealing with the day to day issues House is presently committed to at the same time. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: A Rotary exchange student, one AWA woman and one very excited doctor visit the Project. Preschool graduation day is great event with 15 going on to primary school. Children begin wearing new t-shirts. Astra visits and promises \$1650. Troops put up welcome sign worth \$500. Eight top Government people drop by project to see how things are going. ICA staff and preschoolers invited to opening celebration of a new primary school in the area.

Internal: Whole house joins in celebrations at villager's house.

Contradiction: Finding a new way to bridge the gap between the theory of starting new economic programs and the practices. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: ICA signs Provincial Agreement with Province of North Sumatra. Provincial officials agree to release USD 16,000 immediately for Projects. Second district Community Issues Forum is held in district including Bubun and gets new response from district officials. Five coastal village consultations are complete with documents and miracles held and requests for auxiliary input for next steps. Bubun volleyball tournament brings 40 youth from sub-district city for competition.

Internal: Auxiliary spends three days in Medan doing internal planning, participating in Provincial signing and seeing movie, *Man in a Hurry*.

Contradiction: Catalyzing village leadership to take initiative for planning and initiating the necessary activities to d the projects. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: All five levels of provincial government are present

for a gala traditional opening celebration for the new staff residence. Village leaders in their best clothes are included in official line up at airport to greet Indonesian Cabinet Minister of Social Affairs for his visit to South Sulawesi.

Internal: House visits old friend Anthony Quinn as he stars in *The Message*, the story of the founding of Islam, for year end celebration.

Contradiction: Balancing between Town Meeting push for villagers and creating long awaited internal sign for the village. (Wk. 4)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nam Wai villagers apply for visas to visit Hai Ou in August. Development receives checks for \$3,500.

Internal: New facility continues to take shape with installation and varnishing of blackboard, steps and an inkind air conditioner for the office.

Contradiction: Being the presence in two Hong Kong locations with one adult and one EG staff. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: ICA receives largest grant in Hong Kong of \$71,000. Two more Forums are held. Village prepares for foundations annual general elections. Village leader obtains visa to attend Chicago Prior's Council. Five women start producing fashion accessory bags in new cottage industry.

Internal: Collegiums are held which review the 12-year history of Hong Kong. Data on Guardians and regional colleagues is compiled. English class holds send-out dinner for Bonnell's.

Contradiction: Producing a plan for the future while wrapping things up. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: YMCA requests TM. Steel bars for House are delivered. Land is cleared and foundation is ready for digging. Penny Tung (past city president) visits and fifteen are impressed by Hai Ou's development.

Internal: Bruce Macomber visits and participates in second anniversary celebration planning.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the practical next steps for expanding Hai Ou enterprises. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Development closes the month with 110,000 pesos deposited. Nine consultants from Manila business community go to Davao Mountain Cluster Consults.

Internal: De La Salle University sojourners leave for GRA and Academy. High school youth fly back to Chicago despite DC-10 groundings.

Contradiction: Structuring the internal dimension so that what is clearly possible externally will happen. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House completed arrangements with Seoul House for visit of Hai Ou villagers to Kuh Du E Ri HDP in Korea, marking the second consecutive summer that Hai Ou people have visited another nation and ICA project.

Internal: House completes the creation of summer structures for child care and travel arrangements for staff to Global Council.

Contradiction: Shifting the operating image of the task from "renewing a village in Taiwan" to "releasing a renewed village to serve the world." (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Blue Shirts from five villages gather to write

implementaries for July Corporate Patterns maneuver and write four weeks of ELC curriculum, meimeograph all curriculum aids and make Cluster decor for the five village Assemblies to be held the last week of July to celebrate six month completion. Medical technicians begin weekly visits to Cluster, preparing to do urine, blood and stool exams, and equipping Sudtonggan Health Center to service laboratory testing for these five plus next 16 villages HDP's on Mactan.

Internal: House celebrates Filipino-American Friendship Day (July 4) in the midst of Blue Shirt planning and discontinuity.

Contradiction: Trusting our maneuvers to signal the six month Mactan Cluster completion. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Agriculture Guild harvests two hectares of mangoes in Langub. Forty-two preschool students are recruited in Valenica. Carmen HDP starts general store with 37 members and a trained manager from the village. Twenty farmers from La Paz are recruited for the Mactan Cluster Farmer's Association. Twenty families come back to Magtuod for two weeks vacation in the city.

Internal: House sends out Lester Knutsen for the Global Priors Council.

Contradiction: Giving momentum to the mission with one adult left in the House and 10 children. (Wk. 5)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Ibaraki Prefecture and Saitama Prefecture both contact House to suggest next steps for doing TM in their Prefectures. Mitsui Engineering and Shipbuilding deposit 250,000 yen and call to say they want to do another meeting in Chiba Prefecture.

Internal: House holds a Sayonara Party with 75 colleagues to send Mr. Tonosaki, Yoshi Koshiyama, Rev. Oh, Masayo Koshiyama, Martha Denny, Molly, Jeremiah and Nathan Shaw, and Christina Clark to Chicago.

Contradiction: Maintaining advantages during long summer that will ensure TM and development victories in the next year. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Rural Education Institute provides preschool ramyu lunch. Preschool parents meeting decides that each parent will visit other parents in order to double daily attendance to 60, that parents will provide the daily snack, and that full-dress uniforms will be used in the fall.

Internal: Villager takes Project jeep to service center for inspection repairs.

Contradiction: Seeing that each day is important. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Clergy colleagues donate \$200, propose \$50/month pledge and secures visa for summer program. Strong support letter from country Peace Corps director promises to unplug visa problems once and for all.

Internal: Employer furnished car and driver is boon to permeation travel and general ICA mobility.

Contradiction: Manifesting the Word as the only lasting pillar for all programs and the generals directing them. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Minister of Education gives hope for green belt waiver for community services building already in place. Saemal Director assures \$10,000 each support for seven provincial Projects. Purina okays wholesale feed for village piggy and nearby village sale.

Internal: Sixteen students from Cheonchon college visit and context becomes forum for their possible sojourning over college break.

Contradiction: Working out a winning format for four armies facing eight battles. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House chooses three songs from TM for the nation. Staff check on progress in Okinawa. Materials are prepared for Chicago Council.

Internal: House attends annual summer Yamagasa Festival.

Contradiction: Beginning to set the foundations of program and permeation for next year from the victories of this year. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: New and enthusiastic life comes to House this week as four gifted young people arrive for sojourning. Thursday night brainstorm and gestalt training are held. House has guests for dinner Friday night and studies the *Village* paper. TM is reviewed and work begun by teams on updating leadership materials in two languages.

Internal: House mails TM follow-up letters with translation.

Contradiction: Wrestling to get the weapon to win the victory. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYURARI HDP**

External: Town Meeting set-up for last week in June in Akita and Yamagata prefectures turn the entire region yellow.

Internal: GRA travel money raising circuit to Northern Hokkaido is completed..

Contradiction: Building the movement. (Wk. 11)

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: House completes New South Wales CMA brochure with 12 on state committee and seven sponsors.

Internal: House secures two part-time jobs.

Contradiction: Creating the models of comprehensive campaign set-up which release focused engagement. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Panchayat visit brings together old and new colleagues for a great film night, reignites local Guardian support and elicits referral for Salani from Samoan clergyman.

Internal: Miracles performed by local colleagues as they invite guests, prepare the House and fill the fridge with food, in readiness for the Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Demonstrating the presence of the Perth House while troops are deployed on other fronts. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: House has a wealth of inkind food and celebrates the completeion of golding Australia!

Internal: House schedules and makes contacts for Global Film event for August, particularly new CMA participants and authorization figure.

Contradiction: Finding ways of engaging new CMA contacts and participants. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: House posts 80 Victoria CMA follow-up letters, Geelong ECF host committee meets. Cranbourne Shire secretary sends introductory letter for surrounding seven communities. Development receives \$2,135 plus the \$2,000 grant from Alcoa.

Internal: Self-support task force of three arrives and earns first \$100.

Contradiction: Creating new structures to hold new task for the new troops over the next four to six weeks. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: TM teams come into Canberra with stories of wins and golding all around, in spite of oil crisis and fuel strike. Breakthrough with state health officials enables more federal money to be unlocked and run into Murrin Bridge.

Internal: House celebrates another 20 TMs with hors d'oeuvres, dinner at Guardians home and dancing afterwards.

Contradiction: Finishing 1979-80 authorization planning with all troops out golding. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: Whole House participates in completion of Queensland CMA report brochure which is now ready for printers. Development initiates thrust with unsolicited \$50 coming in mail. May Hancock calls to say she wants to show the global film at her home for patron friends.

Internal: House celebrates pet's birthdays with Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Deciding where the missional focus needs to be. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: Men complete first run of picnic table production as two more are sold. Soft goods industry wins contract to hem 40,000 serviettes by Christmas and produce first screen prints with aboriginal motifs.

Internal: House launches quarter with maneuver planning and redesigned auxiliary collegium space and decor.

Contradiction: Undergirding spirit release in community with self-conscious symbols and rituals. (Wk. 4)

### **SUVA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Impending crises are turned into victories in the nick of time as power returns to island saving 20,000 lbs of frozen chicken and high month end sales plus the return of two field trip ships with cash put TASC in the black again.

Internal: Marshallese custom which dictates "women do not stay alone" brings sojourners into the House. 4th of July is celebrated with traditional wiener roast at the beach.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between TASC's high sales activity and higher immediate cash needs. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Community Forum is held with the British Columbia Coalition for the Disabled. It is a great success with coverage by the Kinsmen's magazine and plans for a larger Forum at their annual meeting with 150-200 people. Contradiction: Making summer months more than just a holding pattern. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP**

External: Mayor visits Congressman Steed and two U.S. Senators while in Washington with FHA. U.S. Senator Boren congratulates town on Step Two of their EPA sewerage enlargement project. Internal: House celebrates July 4th with picnic at area lake.

Contradiction: Keeping the mission moving while standing in the midst of dwindling troops. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: House sends Dana Adkinson to GRA. Conversations with an Oak Cliff community group relative to their sponsoring a neighborhood TM results in proposals.

Internal: Margy lands the job as Director of the Emmanuel Lutheran Day Care Center.

Contradiction: Continuing to plan for September and Quarter II. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: Firehouse restaurant completes first week of operation and grosses over \$2000. GWF is set in Maxton for October 13. Guild meeting elicits decisions to attend GRA and accept major responsibility for summer "Fabulous Fun Days."

Contradiction: Establishing local economic enterprise without local on-going structures of sustenance. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

Contradiction: Making transition from research dynamic to consensus building dynamic as Council participants and GRA work to the learnings of the year. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Guests from several key funding sources attend commerial school graduation. CETA visit results in Training funds for next year. Truck receives safety certification.

Internal: Celebrations abound as Ryan Gilbert is baptized with a champaign breakfast.

Internal: Paula Craddock brings Peru slides for a Saturday night sneak preview at the House.

Contradiction: Creating an effective and set of block club recruitment tactics to undergird Mapleton-Fall Creek stronghold early Quarter I. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

Internal: House completes relocation move with 15 colleagues and neighbors helping.

Contradiction: Keeping attention on the comprehensive mission while unpacking and settling in new facility. (Wk. 1)

Contradiction: Coordinating community volunteers with chapel work schedule to meet May 1 feast day deadline. (Wk. 6)

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Community Council struggles with creating the new in setting up Community Development Revolving Fund. System of drop irrigation is completed for strawberries as winter drought continues throughout Chile.

Internal: House welcomes home Keith and Maicah Marie from Santiago with children's serenading and visits by the community to see the newest member of the auxiliary.

Contradiction: Implementing a plan for the quarter design. (Wk. 5)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: The Health Caretakers graduating from a 12 week training program with diplomas and medical kits go immediately to work as people come to them for first-aid and treatment. Three Brazilians are sent out to the GRA.

Internal: The auxiliary celebrates the 4th of July with bonfire, songs, firecrackers and a birthday cake.

Contradiction: Anticipating staff departures requires reforming of program activities. (Wk. 4)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Anniversary celebration erupts in week of work and wonder, highlighted by first-ever ecumenical service led by Cayman Islands ITI grad, Rev. Lawrence Small. All day assembly led by stake leaders and five simultaneous stake workdays produce four new flower gardens, three resurrected ones, and a grad day of celebration, including fair, banquet, sports and all night dance. Guests include diplomatic representation from three continents (UK, Australia and USA), local public and private sectors and ITI host committee.

Internal: Mervis Edwards returns from Azpitia Consult standing tall and filled with stories of victory.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in place for July and August during the next 10 days, while raising \$6000 to finance it all. (Wk. 13)

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Mexico TM team returns with stories of fine TM event, and gracious reception in Mexico City. Wicker workers obtain new market and sell two dozen baskets in Guatemala City. Sector three workday continues the latrine-digging push on sanitation in village.

Internal: Great celebration Saturday afternoon honors returned Mexico team with fantastic BBQ chicken, potato salad and beer.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum so that water and electricity are made available, while also taking care of the other immediate demands. (Wk. 5)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Three maneuvers are initiated focusing on the Peruvian Independence Day on the 28th of July.

Internal: Preparing for the return of Elsa Batuca and the House's first Emerging Generation member.

Contradiction: Keeping eyes on victory in changing situations. (Wk. 4)

Everyman a developer becomes even more of a reality as John Burbidge and Terry Weygandt gun three month development push in Area Sydney, targeting \$44,000 by August 31. The key contradiction lies in the arena of effective models that allow new forms of creating larger funding base.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Camp Voyage Incredible hosts the Order gathered in Chicago for a great open house on the closing Sunday of the GRA. Hybrid corn detasseling begins at the farm and the 9th graders pull together reflections on their year of international assignment. Centrum gathers for an evening of sharing vignettes of the past year and sharing overwhelming excitement with GRA work and reports. Decision to do "The Voyage of Discovery" with whole Council confirms the global demand for availability of just such a dynamic construct. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning out of all of the present doing what models are required for the future.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports LENS is held with the North Dakota Governors Commission on the Status of Women and 10 representatives from regional and state human resource agencies. This is a breakthrough into major grassroots women's network across the U.S. and Canada and provides entree into several agency networks. A visit with Iowa governor, Robert D. Ray, initiates first steps toward a state-wide TM Campaign. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting clarity on the functions and design of the Global Operations band which will enable the continental and areal maneuvers.

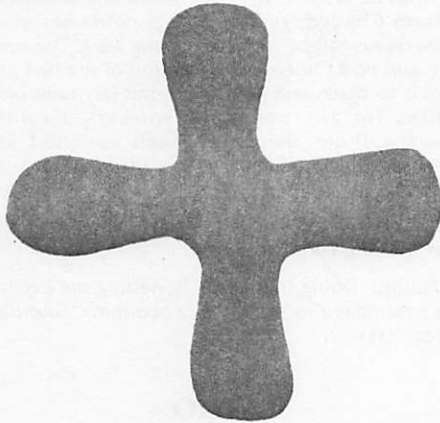
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two more counties are covered with Town Meetings: Somerset and Cornwall. Major responsibility for Powerhouse work is picked up by local leadership in the absence of the auxiliary staff. Thirteen German/Belgian Christian Life Community Youth are hosted enroute to Tai'rgwaith Project.

Internal: Wayside Inn spinning with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use Ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development brings in \$100 from Bank of Scotland, and Scottish engineering association asks for 500 copies of Year of UK report to send to members. Groundwork done for final blitz on remaining 6 Scottish regions, utilizing colleagues' input. Area prior's call from London puts handles on summer vision pointing to a year of local catalysis.

Internal: Five pages of global assignments impacts House with face of the movement.

Contradiction: Learning how to do the Toranaga Maneuver in moving from town to town. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: British Broadcasting Company (BBC2 Wales) spends all day filming in preparation of a nation-wide Welsh program. NCB paints the washery (National Coal Board) and promises to landscape the land which is the entrance to the village. Local company donates blocks for new community company building.

Internal: The Farley family of the Intermediate Technology Group, who offers expertise in building construction visits the Project.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum to finish three month maneuver plan. (Wk. 7)

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diann Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Two Italian families visit as sojourners and give Project impetus for Phase II with important resources breakthroughs. One day's victories include promise of aid from agricultural Inspector, bank officials site visit and discussion of first serious loan possibility with local woodworker, arrival of nine unexpected Italians to assist with visits and translation, the finishing of the first 24 umbrellas by the Robin Hood gang from northern England, approval of Co-op legal papers and location of \$2,000 (US) for industry loan. Daily victory reports and hard practical accountability from Italian colleagues catalyze a real sense of corporate power.

Internal: Visitor and Guardian arrive from USA, bringing House number to 29, with auxiliary delightfully outnumbered 7 to 1. All meals are conducted in two languages.

Contradiction: Responding to the necessary style shifts in Italian culture without blunting the radical edge of creating new social forms. (Wk. 8)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Ijede Children's Club opens, reinstating Children's Institute Program, with 120 three, four and five year olds. Teachers end first week with celebration and curriculum planning. Two in-kind IBM selectric typewriters are delivered, and \$6200 (USD) worth of food and materials for the ITI are received.

Internal: Collegium on "Touchstones of Auxiliary Priorship" raises consciousness on practical ways of exercising corporateness.

Contradiction: Keeping critical equipment repaired and maintained in order to spend less time doing repairs. (Wk. 7)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the future and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch (Flemish) Culture for Quarter III Dorpsdag (GCF) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House gladly welcomes check for f2,500 (US\$1,250) as a wedding gift to Dick and Monique de Koning. Slide presentation on HDTS and the knowledge that local Technical University students have volunteered for HDPs moves Delft Rotary Club to say "yes" to proposal and more support in the future.

Internal: House hosts Richard Kitney, Mark Kocks and Truuske Nortier.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum while doing practical tasks involved in running the House alone. (Wk. 8)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Participation in three-week visit of six youth from Wesel to work in the Kreuzberg Ost Project is great event for all concerned.

Internal: New assignments are welcomed with great anticipation. Area pulls together to staff the work-camp in Kreuzberg Ost as a sign of new things to come.

Contradiction: Holding a helpful tension between being prepared to do it all yourself and waiting for new staff. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Full-time activity preparing for street festival nets over 3,000 DM worth of in-kind, newspaper coverage, operation of sausage, cake, drinks, finger paint and game stands; topped by Guild hosting a Turkish birthday celebration.

Internal: Korean colleague, Park Se Yo, arrives for street festival, bringing added international awareness for both House and community.

Contradiction: Taking time to take a breath and get hold of shifts going on without missing a beat. (Wk. 5)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Second all-community celebration of the quarter honors Institute trustee, Rev. Simfukwe and wife with global report from Chicago, guild victory pantomimes, and 5 new songs. Everyone eats by stakes at closing feast. The opening of the store and Post Office and collection of the first preschool fees added to maizemill income permit payment of the first allowances for all community workers. Kapini's Silas Shachibamba (from Shantumbu) gets confused in Green Warriors soccer match and scores final winning goal for Shantumbu!

Internal: Community takes down the tents as auxiliary moves into new training center.

Contradiction: Doing the research, netting the expertise and creating new image to expand the economic foundations of the Project. (Wk. 9)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 am—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kawangware Co-op Society negotiates with Poultry Keepers Co-op to work out plan for them to lease building to house KITCO activities. Rotary Club in Nairobi decides in just 4 days to loan Kawangware Nursery School K.Sh 25,000 (\$3,000 USD) in order to complete facility for new term opening in September.

Internal: Exciting Week II of decor building and house repair in preparation for Area Council and the new year.

Contradiction: Continuing momentum and at the same time waiting for Area Council to lay out year's plan and assignments. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Number of local visitors increases for site visits as Kamweleni shines from all hilltops with new facility buildings. Social Department students from Nairobi University tour the project with interest in being engaged as part of their study. Officer from Water Department gets an O.K. for research on water at nearby dam. Fifty Sports Club youth celebrate the official opening of Kamweleni sports club and select officers.

Internal: Stockings are sent out for new assignment with chickens as gifts from community people.

Contradiction: Reimagining community cultural rituals and clanship celebration as enabling not blocking community engagement. (Wk. 9)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the Human Development Training School and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murraya to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the *Campaign of the 25*. (Wk. 13)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Guardians meet to firm up and search for more HDTs candidates.

Internal: House fasts and feasts, celebrating Sheahan Paul's birthday with a beautiful chocolate birthday cake. Marie Paul is sent out to Prior's Council, and Roger Butcher is sent out to Vaviharsh.

Contradiction: Catching the train with a flat tire five miles away from the rail station. (Wk. 7)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: The Blanket Industry produces six blankets in the first training week. Rupees 60,000 in wheat is sanctioned by the government to complete road to the village. Demonstration plots are sprayed with pesticides and fertilizers. District Malaria and Health Official visits Nadlapur and gives cholera vaccinations to 210 residents, one-third of the total population.

Internal: Bus and train strike hinders travel for auxiliary and other travelers in and out of Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Getting into the village more. (Wk. 8)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Income analysis indicates a 10% increase in community income in one month from new pandan material industry; 101 trees planted, lining village entrance and main road.

Internal: House sends Julie Hays to Kuala Lumpur to prepare Canadian Embassy proposal and Development push.

Contradiction: Insuring a shadow with each staff member for public and private sector appointments and all tasks in community. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Authorization is strengthened with visa breakthrough in Economic Planning Unit of the Prime Minister's Department and \$6800 from Texas Instruments. Momentum in the village increases even in the midst of the fasting month.

Internal: Everything seems to be moving as colleagues return from Global Priors Council, visas are acquired for new assignments and we anxiously await new arrivals.

Contradiction: Giving form to emerging village consensus. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: After five months of care, chickens begin laying eggs third chicken facility is finished. Mobil Oil donates \$2000 for Consult in Bubun, North Sumatra. Fasting month holiday for pre-school begins. House meets with US AID and Department of Home Affairs to outline steps needed to begin Bubun HDP.

Internal: New intern, Eddy Putra, arrives as new time design and new teams are formed for Islamic fasting month.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum for both staff and village during fasting month. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian Pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO

External: Bontoa HDP Consult is scheduled for October 8—14.

Internal: New assignments mark the beginning of a new project in the region.

Contradiction: Getting assigned troops on location to begin consult preparation and local framing. (Wk. 7)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House joins with Nam Wai auxiliary in *Open Day* celebration; *One Day Wonder* Development in Hong Kong nets \$2000 (US).

Internal: Oberg returns from Tokyo trek; Nexus hosts Joanne Slicker enroute from Maliwada to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Maintaining finger on pulse of activity in zone in midst of pulling together year-end reports. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Appointments, structures and summer program continue in the midst of tropical storm, Agnes. HDP Center comes alive with typing and guitar practice during stormy week.

Internal: First House packet arrives with GRA materials and "Those Who Have Eyes" paper is eagerly studied, followed by a reflective conversation on the past year.

Contradiction: Creating Phase II model and preparing the village for staff departure in the midst of troop disbursement, change of assignments and all kinds of weather. (Wk. 7)

External: Five villagers, the pre-school teacher, and two county officials depart for Sudtonggan (the first trip out of the country for all but one).

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: House continues working toward fruition of two HDP funding proposals.

Internal: Gross income earned in July from teaching English totals a record \$1,000 (USD), helps buoy annual passage over summer financial shoals, and explains why the remnant saw so little of each other.

Contradiction: Keeping minds on the comprehensive as it is, while wondering how it will change. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Hai Ou ICA staff member Katherine Cheng sent out from Taipei for summer program in Oyubari HDP in Hokkaido, Japan.

Internal: Priorship meeting of Taipei House lays foundation for the year with RH-I, RH-13, space, time, decor and sojourn/intern models.

Contradiction: Discerning the victory of the next 45 days which delivers the victory of the entire year. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGANN HDP**

External: Rock and craft orders surge to an all-time high; village painting sees 20 houses painted brilliant colors, with the 130 remaining houses to be finished soon; guild meeting draws largest turnout ever with 180 people (20% of population).

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Visiting principals and Talomo District administration are impressed with improvements in Langub—the elementary school, the day care program, and the new Goodyear Playground.

Internal: Beach birthday party for Becky Cabute and Judy Albers renews everyone's spirits, including the City Mayor's and key Guardians.

Contradiction: Putting new "oomph!!" into ongoing projects. (Wk. 8)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Three participants are recruited for summer program in Oyubari. Two hundred songbooks are printed inkind. Twenty-seven passenger buses begin the journey north to the program.

Internal: Bob Hansen arrives, attends Lutheran conference in Nagano Prefecture, and serves as liturgist for a great House Church.

Contradiction: Building up steam for the fall rather than letting the summer heat sap missional energy. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: House hits the stake Town Meeting at Ban VI as getting ready for next week; preschool materials are sent to Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Great victory of the week was getting the jeep repaired.

Contradiction: Getting consensus without blocking structure among villagers. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult document in Korean is given to printer, and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

External: House experiences the engagement of both the secular and the religious sectors as Guardians affirm role of LENS and advise on preparations for November seminar and Miss Satuki Okouchi comes to House Church with Rev. Nishihara before leaving for Oyubari summer training program.

Internal: Emerging Generation summer program, *Japan Jets*, takes off with seven E.G. from Tokyo and Osaka Houses plus one from colleague family preparing their "village" spaces and building community.

Contradiction: Exposing the spirit dimension of the doing. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: Inking trip to Sapporo nets items for summer program. Visiting and planning with local leaders pulls final details for August together (work projects, stake visiting, elders meeting, etc.). Facility preparation continues full force to prepare to work camps and volunteers.

Internal: House sends out Terry Bergdall to Global Prior's Council.

Contradiction: Implementing strategies for maximum community participation while pulling it all together for a great August. (Wk. 6)

## SYDNEY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Ten days of geographical coverage in one week revitalizes old contacts on Sector Spoof Maneuver. Forty gallons of paint are in-kind for Murrin Bridge Adopt-A-House Maneuver. Mark Mitchell, Oombulgurri citizen, tells the Project's story on three fifteen-minute radio programs.

Internal: House receives elated Buddy Witton enroute from GRA in Chicago to the Murrin Bridge HDP.

Contradiction: Building momentum that places incoming assignees on death ground. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Eight Community Meetings held and 11 set up, bring state campaign total to 80, with goal of 100 in sight before Area Council. In-kind parts, mechanic's time and gifts of \$100 keep circuiters on the road.

Internal: Each day is launched with a spirit event through readings of GRA spins.

Contradiction: Shattering all precedents in order to have a two week head start on next year before going to Area Council. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: All community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lb. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of their own responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Week of proposal writing and follow-up as three proposals totalling \$21,000 are submitted. Youth cluster writes report on the Oombulgurri Youth Trek for submission to the South Australian Schools Commission.

Internal: House ensures Order sustenance for current year by building winning RH-13 projection based on a model requiring only one more job to be secured.

Contradiction: Setting our course futurically prior to Area Council, in midst of ambiguity about shape of next year. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Potter Foundation offers largest grant yet (\$25,000) together with cogent advice on how to use it. Murrin Bridge Industrial shed components all arrive at one place in time for pick up.

Internal: Five Murrin Bridge men are guests of House during week of talks with Potter Foundation and pick up of shed in community four-ton truck.

Contradiction: Making accurate estimates of GCF/GSD data and momentum to let real limits disclose real possibilities. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Ian Potter, Australia's most prestigious foundation, says yes to \$50,000 (Australian). Visit to Minister for Immigration clears the way for U.S. colleagues to gain another one-year temporary residence visa.

Internal: Sustenance model is built to put House in black by 15 October as Sue and Garnet are sent out to bring home "fatted calf" and drop CMA proposal in Adelaide. Area troops arrive keen and running for year of Australia PSU.

Contradiction: Tightening all screws to ready the launch. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: House sends John to Sydney to plan for Area Council. Mark visits aboriginal community leader and sets up a community meeting for October.

Internal: House holds *Year of Australia* Fast and Regional Party.

Contradiction: Doing what we plan to do while feeling we could be doing more. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: An economic acceleration team of Guardians from Melbourne looks at models for using "Murrin Bridge tokens" as an alternative reward system to volunteering time or salaries. The planting of 600 acres of wheat and barley is completed. Painting of the house at the entrance to the community is completed, and the Paint-A-House project moves to the next stake.

Internal: Melbourne Guardians treat the House to dinner on the town.

Contradiction: Breaking through individualistic fated reality to face the possibility of new decisions and a new future. (Wk. 8)

## SUVA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Twenty-eight U.S. government and military VIP's and band members are plane-wrecked at sea near Guam, including Under-secretary Joseph and Mrs. Ruth Van Clefe of the Office of Territorial Affairs, Dept. of Interior. The Marshalls responds with boxes of handicrafts to cheer the hospital patients.

Internal: Finally (after two years) receive permission to have Public Water installed in the Majuro House.

Contradiction: Redirecting motivity of last year's Town Meeting effort and Showplace Community thrust while hearing colleagues wisdom to be conservative. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Apia GCF has 75 bi-lingual people in attendance elicits request to hold GCF for all youth group (ages:12-35 years old) leaders in Apia, to be held in Quarter II.

Internal: Permeator's employer provides two one-way airfares to Chicago, enabling priorship to attend Priors Council.

Contradiction: Setting the context for local grad/colleague decisions to assume responsibility for Apia HDP. (Wk. 4)

## SAN FRANCISCO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Six Guardians travel to Richgrove to participate in pre-consult planning on the sewer system, ending with the completed application. Consultant recruitment continues and in-kind blitz nets flour, fish, beans, fruits and an electrical junction box.

Internal: House welcomes back Barbara and Bob Prather from three months of working with Town Meeting: Iowa, the April Guardian's Consult, and a visit to Inyan Wakagapi.

Contradiction: Using the Consult as the primary tool to spark engagement. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: First Richgrove Fair nets \$700 for Community Center Park and baseball diamond; rabies clinic vaccinates 88 dogs; third newsletter distributed; CETA framing and proposal writing opens more government doors in Tulare County.

Internal: House hosts guests from Cusick and Mill Shoals Consults, Nam Wai HDP, sojourners and Development team.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of neighborhood participation as guilds "cover the waterfront" in several directions. (Wk. 4)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Consult document is presented to community at a Town Meeting which celebrates the first three months of the project with reports of accomplishments, review of the document and visioning of the next three months.

Internal: Another step toward self-support occurs with second House person spending a day at a job tryout.

Contradiction: Making events life-giving rather than just hard work. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Lockman family returns from weekend of work and celebration in Cusick; Rev. Warren Crain visits Cusick for the first of three work projects demonstrating regional support for HDP.

Internal: House move to summer quarters is completed just in time to welcome first guest from England.

Contradiction: Discerning necessary deeds to be done before departure for Council. (Wk. 3)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Six months of planning for the California HDP culminates in active involvement of surprising number of new and old colleagues from Los Angeles Region in HDP setup and consultation alongside Richgrove citizens.

Internal: Bob Vance reports on Richgrove, grounding the story, the reality and commitment to HDPs.

Contradiction: Using Richgrove to advantage as a visible demonstration to increase the momentum and focus the Los Angeles region. (Wk. 11)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult prep becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food, household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: First regional council is scheduled at Cannon Ball on September 16.

Internal: House gets familiar with geography by attending Crow Fair on reservation near Billings.

Contradiction: Getting on top of names and relationships quickly in order to decide our strongholds and plan our maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Grand opening of expanded Shopping Center draws large crowd and has Tribal Chairman blessing the facility and cutting the ribbon. Cannon Ball Industries produces first Trash Barro.

Internal: The great extermination concludes with a House celebration with schooners of brew.

Contradiction: Holding the global tension in the midst of radical particularities. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Saturday workday with 11 participating prepares outside of House and yard. Metro colleagues meet to form five task forces in preparation for Area and Regional Council meetings.

Internal: Hamans arrive and begin settling in with room painting, garden recovery and discovering Denver.

Contradiction: Settling in and creating structures before chaos takes over. (Wk. 9)

### EDMONTON

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: House initiates five week Development blitz with \$475 in hand and \$3750 working, which opens up new networks among architects and accountants, topped off with May 17th advocates event with representatives of six nations and public and private sector.

Internal: Week II is a round of celebrations as Timothy Wright is sent out to USA 12 Consult, initiating his "sabbatical" year of engagement, and House inkind chicken for celebration in the park in honor of Robin Tobin's birthday.

Contradiction: Spinning Development, saturation and the area task into one operation, while standing present to the global priorities, to ensure total victory. (Wk. 8)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

Contradiction: Using the summer effectively to lay the groundwork for Quarter II. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP**

External: \$105,000 HUD grant is approved to build a new water tower. Opening of Community Center begins with band playing, Mayor P.J. Stoll receiving the Center keys, and showing of the movie *Jason and the Argonauts*. Linwood UMC from Oklahoma City spends weekend clearing lot for playground in the rain!

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: House plans Summer 78 celebration and send out to lift up Asherton and Indiahoma Consults and assignments shifts.

Internal: House gets a much needed face-lift as Adkinsons mysteriously show up to paint first floor.

Contradiction: Objectifying the wisdom gathered from last year's victory so that new eyes can appropriate it quickly and move into the new year. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

Contradiction: Convincing the state government to give us promised funds to do our program (TM Saturation) as their program while keeping it local man's program. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Collegium on saturation intensifies significance of visits to Roman Catholic colleagues during new facility maneuver.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic enables renewed experience of Daily Office with room full of people.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between "looking before you leap" and "he who hesitates is lost". (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Trip to Jackson, MS. with Pace troop to lead training session with Governor's Volunteer Office is possible method for this year's saturation in Mississippi.

Internal: House welcomes Suzanne Heilman and prepares pre-Area Council maneuvers in midst of fireman/policeman's strike and curfew. Lifting of curfew is celebrated with downtown music.

Contradiction: Clarifying consensus of necessary tasks before Council. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Five Georgian colleagues serve as consultants to the Gibson HDP. In-kind effort nets 125 pounds of peanut butter and five cases of pickles.

Internal: Assignment of all troops to locations outside of Atlanta.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the Movement not involved first-hand in the Gibson Project. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: GHDP moves on authorization with the following confirmations: U.S. Congressman William Hefner will be the guest of honor at the Labor Day Picnic and Parade; permission to demolish old building is granted—permission the community said was impossible to get; two graduate students from North Carolina State University will assist in redesigning the downtown area; Seaboard Coast Line Railroad will give the old depot to the Town of Gibson in ceremony at the Labor Day Parade and Picnic; and St. Andrews College will print the *Voice* biweekly for a nominal fee.

Internal: House experiences intensified corporateness with late night and long hours of house painting and decor building in preparation for Sunday Open House.

Contradiction: Operating out of old economic and political images of how to make decisions and set up new businesses. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Xerox prints Florida Summary Report free and United Telephone sends grant of \$300.

Internal: Church gives two weeks paid so staff can go to Gibson Consult.

Contradiction: Knowing what to do and doing it now to be ready for late August. (Wk. 12)

Contradiction: Training new troops in the midst of distractions of ongoing business. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Many Fifth City citizens attend GRA sessions, and GRA visits Fifth City; \$35,000 assured for Elders Action Center; model for summer use of recreation center created, with task force taking charge.

Contradiction: Maintaining a focused time design that will allow significant Council participation, while sustaining ongoing project momentum. (Wk. 5)

External: Letters from towns in response to the question, "What happened after your town meeting?" report that newsletters, grant requests, cleanup days, more town meetings, joining the PRIDE (state community development program), and plans for a festival are in the works.

Contradiction: Moving on while the summer program answers all of the questions. (Wk. 8)

Contradiction: Keeping momentum, planning, and training going after explosion of workday. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The International Lions Convention in Tokyo in June excites colleagues with possibilities of visiting both the convention and HDPs along the way.

Internal: House experiences first week of new House location in the middle of the city by taking mini-tours of area.

Contradiction: Wetting peoples' appetites for far away places while also exciting them about the possibilities of participating in HDPs right here at home. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

Contradiction: Designing a model for self-support which provides flexible use of time and plenty of money. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: The new Widen Community Library arrives with 800 volumes. The grand opening draws over 30 residents who enjoy punch and cookies and check out nearly 100 volumes.

Internal: Two new youth (Liz Reese and Cari Boivin) arrive and nine churchmen from Cleveland come for 4-day work party.

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Harrisburg Metro briefing moves from a simple introduction to the Institute evening to an event celebrating the New Reality with first-hand reports of colleague engagement on three continents.

Internal: Morning collegiums on saturation, self-support and space become signal happenings in their ability to deal with particular and immediate concerns in a comprehensive and missional context.

Contradiction: Securing comprehensive representation from the region at the upcoming Area Council. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Copies of collegium models and workshop procedures are mailed to each of the Houses in Area New York to enable consensus building in preparation for New York Area Council.

Internal: Both House and regional colleagues are doing significant brooding prior to Council.

Contradiction: Occasioning the destinal calling of TWC of Area New York which rests on technical ability to pull off the Area Council. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Loisada (New York City) colleagues are hosted by Starks community on workday. A playground is designed and "River of Tomorrow" historical drama is written and cast.

Internal: The Higgins, Whitneys and Tolmans visit Starks, bringing global news.

Contradiction: Juggling time and forces to make scheduled events come off. (Wk. 7)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Preparation for Area Council underway with a mailing to over 100 people and follow-up phoning is begun. Campaign Night session with ten around the table completes grid to polis level.

Internal: House celebrates Mark Whitney's send-out to Kinney and his upcoming birthday by going out to dinner and claiming promises.

Contradiction: Establishing a milieu of victory immediately which entices colleagues to decide to be counted among the Global Servant Force. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Simultaneous work bee in Charlotteville and Regional Council in Binghamton demonstrate passion for both the local and the region.

Internal: Sojourner Andrew Harvey adds logging skills to mechanics skills already acquired.

Contradiction: Building the one-month vision that motivates to specific action. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Advanced program contacts pay off as we receive calls and set appointments for Youth Forums and GWF. Great Week 7 HDP workday involves four regional colleagues.

Internal: Whole House present with the arrival of the Stocks.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the whole task while trying to engage colleagues in the task. (Wk. 8)

### **MONTREAL**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: First metro stronghold is identified as regional network grants initial approval to saturation proposal. Area Council creates 19-page document for year and Quarter II maneuvers.

Internal: All 50 participants at Area Council attend Riviere de Prairie community celebration for the opening of the arena—a project which was initiated three years ago with a Community Forum there.

Contradiction: Seeing the maneuver that will catalyze peripheral interest into united action amidst the amazing possibilities for saturation through networks and agencies. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Area Council in Montreal plans Quarter I maneuvers with Toronto regional colleagues present.

Internal: First House meeting with all assigned present focuses on new House facility, missional operation, and self-support.

Contradiction: Recovering Toronto/London regional momentum and symbolic presence after one year absence. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: 1978-79 House regroups around Area Council in Montreal, then disperses again to give momentum to new quarter's area thrust.

Internal: Ottawa House takes on task of breaking open new orbit in self-support for Area.

Contradiction: Transforming high rationality rapidly into high actuality against constraints of troops and funds. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Lornecraft Furniture Division debuts with first exhibition outside county. New Day Canada mailing completed and three teams cover New Brunswick.

Internal: Report of Hermel Lapointe and Muriel Chamberlain on GRA at Ecclesiola represents not only community, but also ICA.

Contradiction: Sustaining motivity and corporate work patterns in the face of continuing struggle to get on necessary deeds of summer. (Wk. 7)

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Youth summer program is launched and highlighted by a day-long pre-school outing to the zoo in Caracas.

Internal: Auxiliary entertains landscape architect who creates image of a flowering plaza, catalyzing enthusiasm for the plaza building.

Contradiction: Being trapped into sustaining the project rather than creating corporate, life-giving events. (Wk. 7)

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: The Commercial Guild surges ahead with the establishment of three task forces: rabbit industry, sewing commission, and wicker industry. Local resident will teach 18 villagers how to work with a native fiber to create wicker baskets and furniture for export market. Guardians are key to opening doors to resolve issues related to land ownership. Inkind team nets two bus shelters from Ministry of Transport and grass seed for community center, plaza, and soccer field.

Internal: Auxiliary provides one gallon of blood for heart surgery for local resident.

Contradiction: Coordinating the wide range of activities projected for the coming week to ensure people and materials in the right place at the right time. (Wk. 9)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; pre-school with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Human Development Project goes visible as 75 people turn out for a work day on Monday on the village square, brushing 500 feet of roadside banks, building retaining walls, flower beds and gigantic welcome sign, chopping and removing 16 fallen logs; lunch in-kind, prepared, and served to all; first copies of Consult Document roll off the JAMAL Press, resplendent in yellow covers with green and black printing (National Colors).

Internal: Troops abound, as Bingham return from family heritage trek, receive Anthony Braithwaite of Woburn Lawn as new auxiliary; Teresa is sent out to the GRA; lumber arrives to build collegium tables, while Kingston House Maneuver creates space, time and forces designs for expended living.

Contradiction: Securing the materials and finances to do all the tactics while going ahead and launching programs on all fronts with what we have. (Wk. 4)

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is tranformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant of \$50,000 for the planning of the USA 12 economic components has been approved. Canberra announces that Ian Potter, Australia's most prestigious foundation says "yes" to \$50,000 contribution. Maneuver-building was the highlight of Week II, with new configurations for Metro Circuits, Continental Axes, and Global Systems Patrols. The key contradiction lies in the arena of moving swiftly in solid formation to catch the wave of motivity out of Area Councils, while capitalizing on victories of the past six months to converge in a winning month of September.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a Week II Centrum maneuver session results in a timeline which gives power and drama to the coming quarter and allows the launching of task forces on the HDTS, the Phase I program, the Global Academy, Summer transcript completion, the Ecclesiola Manual, the Journal, the Internal Life Guide, and Support Systems. Registrations and requests for Academy flow in from Ghana, Kenya, U.K., Kinney, metro colleagues, and volunteers in off the street. The flexible formation of task forces allows lightning advances on several maneuvers simultaneously and imbues the task with a liturgical mode. The key contradiction lies in the arena of providing imaginal shapes and modes for the year's thrust in the midst of the hazy statement of the components of the being of the coming year.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that impact courses were held in two North American HDPs—Imaginal Education and Community Youth Forums were held in Lorimor and a Community Youth Forum was held in Inyan Wakagapi. A representative was sent to Area Council in Edmonton and experimented with impact training along with workshops on Development and self-support. Theatre maneuvers were built for the next quarter. Pan American Airways free round trip ticket for new flight from Rome to Istanbul (with New York to Rome return thrown in) enhances Order travel. Breakthroughs occurred in the realization that saturation of impact courses has already begun in Area Chicago and that training can be simplified. The key contradiction lies in the arena of determining the unifying image of the three major themes in the midst of relative clarity in our do's.

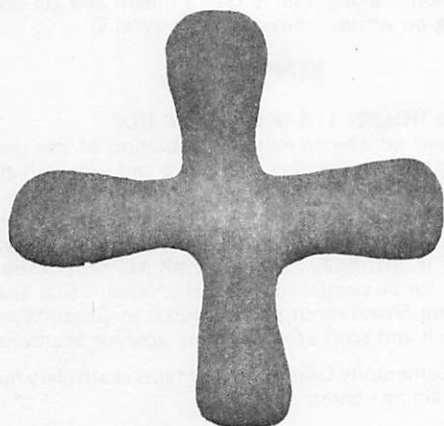
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Wayside Inn spinning with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use Ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: £100 arrives from the Scottish Engineer's Association in the midst of TM set-up in two new districts of Borders and Central.

Internal: Gemma Astori from Italy and Don Cramer of London arrive with stories, materials and new songbooks and help with TM set-up.

Contradiction: Enabling regional colleagues to assume total responsibility for TM Campaign in midst of family and other priorities. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: British Broadcasting Company (BBC2 Wales) spends all day filming in preparation of a nation-wide Welsh program. NCB paints the washery (National Coal Board) and promises to landscape the land which is the entrance to the village. Local company donates blocks for new community company building.

Internal: The Farley family of the Intermediate Technology Group, who offers expertise in building construction visits the Project.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum to finish three month maneuver plan. (Wk. 7)

Internal: Three more troops join the House, as Leah Dunbar comes up for Development appointments, with Anne-Marie Murphy to assist with E.G. structures, and Diann Porter joins the Town Meeting Circuiters.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves in fourth gear, whilst everyone else seems to have the clutch in. (Wk. 5)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Two Italian families visit as sojourners and give Project impetus for Phase II with important resources breakthroughs. One day's victories include promise of aid from agricultural Inspector, bank officials site visit and discussion of first serious loan possibility with local woodworker, arrival of nine unexpected Italians to assist with visits and translation, the finishing of the first 24 umbrellas by the Robin Hood gang from northern England, approval of Co-op legal papers and location of \$2,000 (US) for industry loan. Daily victory reports and hard practical accountability from Italian colleagues catalyze a real sense of corporate power.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP)**

Internal: Visitor and Guardian arrive from USA, bringing House number to 29, with auxiliary delightfully outnumbered 7 to 1. All meals are conducted in two languages.

Contradiction: Responding to the necessary style shifts in Italian culture without blunting the radical edge of creating new social forms. (Wk. 8)

**LAGOS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP**

External: Ijede Children's Club opens, reinstating Children's Institute Program, with 120 three, four and five-year-olds. Teachers end first week with celebration and curriculum planning. Two in-kind IBM selectric typewriters are delivered, and \$6200 (USD) worth of food and materials for the ITI are received.

Internal: Collegium on "Touchstones of Auxiliary Priorship" raises consciousness on practical ways of exercising corporateness.

Contradiction: Keeping critical equipment repaired and maintained in order to spend less time doing repairs. (Wk. 3)

**BRUSSELS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel arrangements.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuristic and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Official notification of 230,000 BF (\$6,400 US) grant from Belgian Ministry of Dutch.(Flemish) Culture for Quarter III Dorpsdag (GCF) received in Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on history of religious orders intensifies understanding of the role of the religious in society.

Contradiction: Using inside data to unblock 2-year red tape time limit for new proposals. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Colleagues re-engaged in Global Community Forum campaign due to advantages gained by colleagues setting up GCF appointments; seeing a GCF grad about doing another Forum in his turf; and a check for GCF.

Internal: "Demon Demolition Maneuver" transforms House space into the land of the New Reality.

Contradiction: Using advantage of colleagues' social demonstration vision to release engagement in GCF maneuvers in the Netherlands. (Wk. 10)

**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Germany's grasp of value of TM in high-rise apartments is manifest in Vogelstang community contacting ICA with a steering committee ready. Elizabeth Sands returns from closing celebration of three week-long working vacation in Kreuzberg Ost for Protestant youth. One youth decides to stay on and two others consider internship.

Internal: The Michaels pass through on way to new assignment and House hosts Ulricke Von Kampen and friend.

Contradiction: Meeting all the task commitments in the midst of staff relocations and discontinuity. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP**

External: Full-time activity preparing for street festival nets over 3,000 DM worth of in-kind, newspaper coverage, operation of sausage, cake, drinks, finger paint and game stands; topped by Guild hosting a Turkish birthday celebration.

Internal: Korean colleague, Park Se Yo, arrives for street festival, bringing added international awareness for both House and community.

Contradiction: Taking time to take a breath and get hold of shifts going on without missing a beat. (Wk. 5)

**KINSHASA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP**

External: Second all-community celebration of the quarter honors Institute trustee, Rev. Simfukwe and wife with global report from Chicago, guild victory pantomimes, and 5 new songs. Everyone eats by stakes at closing feast. The opening of the store and Post Office and collection of the first preschool fees added to maizemill income permit payment of the first allowances for all community workers. Kapini's Silas Shachibamba (from Shantumbu) gets confused in Green Warriors soccer match and scores final winning goal for Shantumbu!

Internal: Community takes down the tents as auxiliary moves into new training center.

Contradiction: Doing the research, netting the expertise and creating new image to expand the economic foundations of the Project. (Wk. 9)

**CAIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Marathon workday (6 am—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

**NAIROBI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: Tuesday night Kawangware Leadership Meeting becomes time of reflection and vision as grieving local man sees the gift of both the life and death of their great leader and a way to move that greatness into the future. Guardian dynamic manifests itself with assistance given in securing work permit and passport. Site visit from Rotary releases interest in earth block house. The visitor is related to Housing Finance Corporation of Kenya.

Internal: Nicholas Kisumba arrives from Kamweleni to participate in Farm Training Program for three months . . . the first from outside Kawangware.

Contradiction: Being self-conscious and not entrenched in disabling patterns without seeing a way to move beyond them. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP**

External: Kamweleni Road becomes the major road from Machakos as the other roads become impassable. Kalai donates ¼ acre for block industry. Kamweleni farmers put up beehives donated by Ministry of Agriculture, at the same time celebrate their first harvest of vegetables.

Internal: House welcomes Kathy and Tim Dyhr.

Contradiction: Engaging troops effectively in midst of moving and preparation for Area Council. (Wk. 10)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in its relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the Human Development Training School and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The maneuvers for 25 projects are enabled as papaya seeds are delivered. The State Bank of India adopts 15 villages. The Polyester Khadi Industry is finalized.

Internal: Sent out Gordon Harper family to Chicago and Hanna Murray to Kreuzberg Ost. Celebrated the completed life of N. Gavai.

Contradiction: Anticipating how to move beyond the six weeks of the Campaign of the 25. (Wk. 13)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Vinay Jacob, Vivian Paul and Maxine Butcher attend project directors meeting in Bombay. Jane Coe plans with House for a shramdan (workday) in Madangir. Global Language School starts in St. Paul's School.

Internal: New songbooks bring back new spirit and Order memory.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers to intensity the mission and keep troops busy on the road in the midst of heavy rains. (Wk. 7)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: The Blanket Industry produces six blankets in the first training week. Rupees 60,000 in wheat is sanctioned by the government to complete road to the village. Demonstration plots are sprayed with pesticides and fertilizers. District Malaria and Health Official visits Nadlapur and gives cholera vaccinations to 210 residents, 1/3 of the total population.

Internal: Bus and train strike hinders travel for auxiliary and other travelers in and out of Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Getting into the village more. (Wk. 8)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Jalawai Amba, first Iban intern sent to GRA Chicago and global assignment.

Internal: House celebrates fourth wedding anniversary of Westre family. Discontinuous ecclesiola plans initiated with night at the beach, complete with fried chicken and music.

Contradiction: Protecting project and program coordination when current demands of Management functions continually overshadow House. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Income analysis indicates a 10% increase in community income in one month from new pandan material industry; 101 trees planted, lining village entrance and main road.

Internal: House sends Julie Hays to Kuala Lumpur to prepare Canadian Embassy proposal and Development push.

Contradiction: Insuring a shadow with each staff member for public and private sector appointments and all tasks in community. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Authorization is strengthened with visa breakthrough in Economic Planning Unit of the Prime Minister's Department and \$6800 from Texas Instruments. Momentum in the village increases even in the midst of the fasting month.

Internal: Everything seems to be moving as colleagues return from Global Priors Council, visas are acquired for new assignments and we anxiously await new arrivals.

Contradiction: Giving form to emerging village consensus. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Victory! New chicken industry sells first 400 eggs (from the first of three stake chicken houses) to buyer who will take up to 10,500 weekly. Powerful regional/project maneuver planning for 78-79 takes one day, not three weeks as before.

Internal: House welcomes Cocks, sends out Nurul to Bayad via Maliwada HDTs and Atack and Soedarno to Bontoa.

Contradiction: Configuring staff and village for three campaigns in two regions and hitting the road. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it and is felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO

External: Bontoa HDP Consult is scheduled for October 8-14.

Internal: New assignments mark the beginning of a new project in the region.

Contradiction: Getting assigned troops on location to begin consult preparation and local framing. (Wk. 7)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development begins the week with a bang by making a drop-in call and picking up HK\$2,000! Nexus becomes "Grand Central Station" as resettlement continues across the area and globe.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

Internal: Nexus welcomes two new families, the Roy Philbrooks, and the Ken Hamje family; all participate in facility renovation and cleaning in preparation for the new year, ending with celebrative happy hour.

Contradiction: Starting the action that will remove the doubt that theory cannot solve. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Appointments, structures and summer program continue in the midst of tropical storm, Agnes. HDP Center comes alive with typing and guitar practice during stormy week.

Internal: First House packet arrives with GRA materials and "Those Who Have Eyes" paper is eagerly studied, followed by a reflective conversation on the past year.

Contradiction: Creating Phase II model and preparing the village for staff departure in the midst of troop disbursement, change of assignments and all kinds of weather. (Wk. 7)

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: House continues working toward fruition of two HDP funding proposals.

Internal: Gross income earned in July from teaching English totals a record \$1,000 (USD), helps buoy annual passage over summer financial shoals, and explains why the remnant saw so little of each other.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and corporateness while waiting for new staff. (Wk. 10)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Visits to Pepsico and guardians confirm strong support for our work.

Internal: Jenkins are sent out and Hansons and Griffees visit the House.

Contradiction: Keeping the battle going while changing the guard. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: House hits the stake Town Meeting at Ban VI as getting ready for next week; preschool materials are sent to Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Great victory of the week was getting the jeep repaired.

Contradiction: Getting consensus without blocking structure among villagers. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: All community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lb. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of their own responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Week of proposal writing and follow-up as three proposals totalling \$21,000 are submitted. Youth cluster writes report on the Oombulgurri Youth Trek for submission to the South Australian Schools Commission.

Internal: House ensures Order sustenance for current year by building winning RH-13 projection based on a model requiring only one more job to be secured.

Contradiction: Setting our course futurically prior to Area Council, in midst of ambiguities about the year. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP**

External: Proposal for purchase of Vogar Community Store by couple is submitted to ARDA. Auxiliary spends long weekend in Edmonton at Area Council. Internal: Colleagues invited to Area Council using Sears WATS lines.

Contradiction: Winning by using the grid's gifts along with two years of field experience. (Wk. 10)

Contradiction: Beginning a fantastic new year with veteran colleagues who are so clear about both the glory and the pain involved in concretizing the victories of the year. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: House receives letter from Hospital Heights in the City of New Castle, describing remarkable accomplishments since June 14 Town Meeting. Jeanne Wilson is sent to Michigan to prepare Department of Labor proposal for GWF across Michigan.

Internal: House paints new worship room, E.G. room and collegium room, celebrates two E.G. birthdays, sends out Ruth Landmann to new assignment and enjoys visit by Mary D'Souza.

Contradiction: Designing a model for self-support which provides flexible use of time and plenty of money. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House visits colleagues in Hamilton where Norman Copley assumed new church responsibilities, and heard exciting reports from Antenens on summer neighborhood Town Meetings.

Internal: Super sleuth maneuvers keep House members searching for the elusive clue that will reveal new rent-free facility.

Contradiction: Finding self-support jobs before Area Council. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Council participants meet to rehearse maneuver building methodology in preparation for Guild's Quarter I maneuver workshop. Town Meeting campaign receives check in mail from Sears, Detroit group, for \$300 and readies cars for circuits.

Internal: House completes necessary construction on inked facility and symbolizes the year's new game with inked seats at Lions' pre-season opening football game.

Contradiction: Naming the immediate victory that claims the new year for the entire region. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: *Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.*

Contradiction: *Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)*

### **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Three long late night workshops force out a new regional grid to the metro level and plot valenced advocacy as the beginning of a comprehensive regional frame.

Internal: Collegium on global priorities allows the House to see the possibility of concretely acting out each priority within the turf of the New York region.

Contradiction: Ensuring comprehensive coverage of the region in Area Council in order to do effective saturation. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Metro participates in the dynamic of GRA: reports and research.

Internal: Area data gathering reminds us of care and accountability.

Contradiction: Articulating activity of programs as profound humanness so that formulated region sees itself filling all GSF roles. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: House travels to Binghamton for Regional Council where new grid to micros lays groundwork for year's campaign. Library research and forays to nearby metros help ground us in our turf.

Internal: Job secured, car repaired, first maneuvers written, in-kinding yields first fruits—and House experiences itself off and running.

Contradiction: Doubling efforts to assure regional participation in Area Council to provide for a wider understanding of year's missional direction. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: The entire House participates in Prior's Council while new sojourner holds down the homefront.

Internal: House members return from Global Prior's Council and Phase I camp, and one permeator receives \$100 per week raise.

Contradiction: Communicating the excitement, enthusiasm and historical significance of the GCF campaign to regional colleagues. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Regionalis is key as Saturday is spent in reworking Washington D.C. regional grid with colleagues from Baltimore and Richmond and then celebrating the summer and the coming year with metro briefing Saturday night.

Internal: House hosts youth group from Cleveland here to work in Ivy City, receives Mike Rush enroute to Isle of Dogs and sends out Sherri Rozenthal to North Carolina.

Contradiction: Moving from the discontinuous summer rhythm to building comprehensive weekly maneuvers that anticipate the next quarter. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: The new Widen Community Library arrives with 800 volumes. The grand opening draws over 30 residents who enjoy punch and cookies and check out nearly 100 volumes.

Internal: Two new youth (Liz Reese and Cari Boivin) arrive and nine churchmen from Cleveland come for 4-day work party.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum high while all go to Area Council and projects shift to acceleration. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: House and metro colleagues participate in Charlotteville workday and great barbeque celebration.

Internal: House Church send out for another metro colleague. Ann Howie, from Philadelphia to Cano Negro.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum of Area Council and starting saturation campaigns in the midst of overwhelming House resettlement. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Development takes off with signal foundation call, village adoption journeying, and inkind victories.

Internal: Workshops produce new regional grid and system for holding information on advocates, as groundwork for doing saturation in the region.

Contradiction: Ensuring comprehensive representation of the New York Region in Area Council in order to set the stage for effective saturation next year. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: *The River of Tomorrow* historical musical drama celebrates the end of Summer Starks Trekkers Program with the appearance of 110 real residents and the famous General John Stark. The Boston crew participates in a big workday with a potluck supper and barn dance.

Internal: Steven Crawford is received as an intern and James Hamje arrives.

Contradiction: Projecting events clearly enough and far enough in advance to maneuver local people into leadership roles. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Regional meeting in Boston enables consensus on the regional grid and initiates thinking about the placement of the saturation strongholds.

Internal: Regional celebration in Brockton, MA at Paul LaVie's is a grand time for all.

Contradiction: Diving into the year, internally, before Area Council, in order to continue depth brooding and to enable full participation at the Council. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Picnic and Panchayat visit occasion opportunities for local people to participate in reflection and decision to work with the project.

Internal: Collegial support abounds as House welcomes visitors from Philadelphia House, the Lindblad family, Mrs. Alice Baker, Alice Neill and family and Neil Vance and Pat Moriarity.

Contradiction: Effectively engaging community participation in planning for action. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: All day regional planning event reveals new dimensions for enlisting colleague engagement.

Internal: House and regional colleagues attend fall reception and kick-off celebration at Paul Le Vie's home in Brockton, Massachusetts.

Contradiction: Collecting data for possible saturation strongholds in turf we have not been in for two years. (Wk. 10)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: A week of surprises as New Day Canada circuits reveal many CFC proposals being implemented and openness of the Co-op Union of Canada; \$7,025 in developed money arrives by mail throughout the week.

Internal: Saturation mural re-creates backporch space—created and painted by youth.

Contradiction: Effectively exploding the maneuver that will give Montreal the running jump to hit the new year. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: House and regional colleagues initiate the first HDP site selection trip in the densely populated heartland of Ontario.

Internal: Movement colleagues are mobilized in House search and guest list grows for every house event as colleagues call up house and invite themselves over.

Contradiction: Moving at high speed with three campaigns while creating the Religious House presence. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Twelve regional colleagues gather at House to mark beginning of New Year. Saturation enthusiasm is present.

Internal: Houser is renovated and redecored with inkind carpet, paint and curtains. Contradiction: Uncertainty over

New Day Canada requirements in New Brunswick creates hesitancy in committing ourselves regionally. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: A major push on commissions is illustrated by half day of educational guild PSU planning the year's preschool and adult education program. The first credit union meeting of the year is held with election of four new board members and the movie *Moses Coady*, who started Co-ops and Credit Unions in the Maritimes.

Internal: Sent Camille Francoeur (cabinet maker), and Colman Lapointe (manager of LEDC), as part of delegation to bi-area meeting in Vogar.

Contradiction: Finding ways of giving opportunity for community to work in teams, under assignment. (Wk. 10)

**CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Youth summer program is launched and highlighted by a day-long pre-school outing to the zoo in Caracas.

Internal: Auxiliary entertains landscape architect who creates image of a flowering plaza, catalyzing enthusiasm for the plaza building.

Contradiction: Being trapped into sustaining the project rather than creating corporate, life-giving events. (Wk. 7)

**BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Formation of leadership core in evening meeting for training, context expansion and problem solving adds momentum to guild activity. Alcalde mayor visits with wife and community social worker and stays three hours discussing many ideas and offering insights on project plans.

Internal: Larger collegium room for additional people in evening leadership meeting is created by moving auxiliary staff rooms and personnel.

Contradiction: Forming new groups quadruples logistics and catches us unprepared for expanded enablement. (Wk. 10)

**RIO DE JANEIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; preschool with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

**HAVANA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: The community celebrates a week of solid foundations as the groundbreaking ceremony for the new preschool building is held, the first major supply of lumber for the furniture industry is unloaded, and the preschool T-shirts arrive.

Internal: The House and community send out Mr. J.S. Dethé by celebrating Indian Independence Day with an Indian feast and Jamaican dancing.

Contradiction: Spending nine hours on the bus to have a five hour day in Kingston. (Wk. 10)

**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is transformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports that a two day blitz completes 20-page Canadian brochure and delivers it to the printer. Sears, Roebuck and Co., following four hour site visit to Fifth City, requests proposal for USA-12 support which was completed and submitted for September Board review. New computer programming produces monthly U.S./Canadian contributors list for quick turn-around reporting across the continent. Breakthroughs occur as Area Councils focus attention on memorials toward program self-sufficiency and Centrum Area Development team members at the Councils create battleplans with each area. The contradiction lies in the arena of closing complicated contractual agreements while breaking open new orbits for future funding.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

A Global Research Centrum blitz maneuver completes the Internal Life Guide and sends it to be printed. The Academy enters it intensive recruitment phase while the Ecclesiola task force becomes the focus of attention. Continual experimentation with maneuvering begins to uncover the lifestyle of maneuvering at all operational levels. Phase I launches into the next year with a new vision of the resources of Phase I for the mission across the globe. High school clusters and global deployment of 9th graders signal the new victory. The contradiction lies in the arena of finding ways to focus our energy on the images of service necessary not only for this year but for the 1980's and beyond.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports the completion of Quarter II maneuvers. Signal events are a health trek to Woburn Lawn, Global Women's Forum in Lorimor HDP and visit from Brian Smith, returning from working in three projects. A new role for Global Operations Centrum is emerging as the Centrum forges out models that anticipate and inform the future beyond the immediate pressures of the field maneuvers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of refining the quarter's timeline in order to focus engagement and put weekly urgencies in perspective.

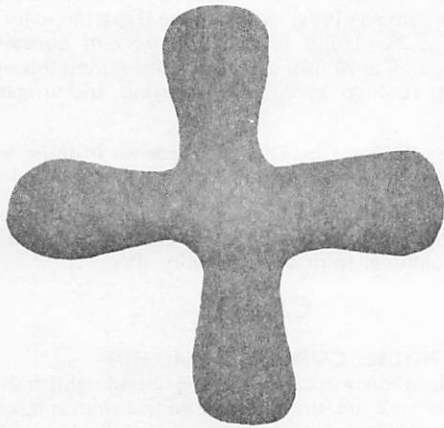
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Internal: Wayside Inn spinning with people enroute to new assignments, sojourners and guests of staff who use Ecclesiola to reflect on the spirit happenings of the summer.

Contradiction: Dealing with new data coming in on the campaigns when structures are not there to do mid-course corrections. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: £100 arrives from the Scottish Engineer's Association in the midst of TM set-up in two new districts of Borders and Central.

Internal: Gemma Astori from Italy and Don Cramer of London arrive with stories, materials, new songbooks and help with TM set-up.

Contradiction: Enabling regional colleagues to assume total responsibility for TM Campaign in midst of family and other priorities. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Completion of Adventure Playground marks the end of the rapid visibility phase, and community building negotiations herald the establishment of a solid economic sign.

Internal: The tribe attempts to settle in, as the lounge becomes international with 15 Germans, one Belgian, two English, and two French.

Contradiction: Focusing momentum while moving without having a plan to run with. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Addressograph-Multigraph prints, free of charge, 48-page report on the first 22 Community Forums in France. They also agreed to print 2000 workbooks and expedited in-kind of 50,000 sheets of paper. This fall ICA staff will be trained to run their machines, with unlimited access thereafter.

Internal: In a flurry of last minute preparation and tying up of loose ends, six from the House depart for GRA.

Contradiction: Keeping everything moving and not losing advantages during the "vacation" months. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Participation in Ferragosto celebrations in Termine, Rome and Puglia deepens understanding of the national traditions. Pope's death addresses whole country and world.

Internal: Long-range brooding on the Italian campaign reveals clarity on the other side of intensive engagement and radical discontinuity.

Contradiction: Building effective engagement patterns between summer and fall maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Ijede Children's Club opens, reinstating Children's Institute Program, with 120 three, four and five year olds. Teachers end first week with celebration and curriculum planning. Two in-kind IBM selectric typewriters are delivered, and \$6200 (USD) worth of food and materials for the ITI are received.

Internal: Collegium on *Touchstones of Auxiliary Priorship* raises consciousness on practical ways of exercising corporateness.

Contradiction: Keeping critical equipment repaired and maintained in order to spend less time doing repairs. (Wk. 3)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Rounding up Phase I of summer travel.

Internal: Impromptu celebration of three-member Nexus happens with whiskey sours, Indian curry and profound conversation on musical journey of Paul Simon.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on the futuristic and comprehensive while immediacy of travel and maintenance consumes Nexus. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Regional Council plans for saturation maneuvers, approval for next four months funding by the Ministry and gridding Belgium to 216 micros, setting stage for next year.

Internal: New office decor and corporate timeline of Europe declare the new year in being.

Contradiction: Nailing down key issues so they can be dealt with. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Colleagues re-engaged in Global Community Forum campaign due to advantages gained by colleagues setting up GCF appointments; seeing a GCF grad about doing another Forum in his turf; and a check for GCF.

Internal: "Demon Demolition Maneuver" transforms House space into the land of the New Reality.

Contradiction: Using advantage of colleagues' social demonstration vision to release engagement in GCF maneuvers in the Netherlands. (Wk. 10)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: First circuit of new year to Ruhr Valley has colleagues discussing strategic program thrust for year and signing up for sojourn terms in Kreuzberg Ost. Africa movement becomes topic that leads families to consider greater involvement in ICA and Order.

Internal: Hannerl Golda and children arrive by train while Manfred Golda drives from Vienna to start their intern year. Susanne Fricke returns with circuit team to sojourn. Geri Tolman arrives from Nairobi.

Contradiction: Creating the process to quickly transfer and train new House members as schedule requires new members to go it alone. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Renovation of *treffpunkt* basement takes major step forward with 1200 Deutsche Marks worth of electrical supplies donated by Siemens, Senioren celebrate "old rag" ball with result that two community women take responsibility for Senioren program themselves. Park Department delivers lumber for park fences and local citizens begin to build the railings. First year anniversary celebration day of Cafe Laterne

is a huge celebrative and financial success!

Internal: Collegiums on maneuver explode and re-image House operating methods.

Contradiction: Updating the House on GRA and Priors Council while accelerating Project actuation. (Wk. 11)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Development harvest begins with a grant of \$15,000 from the US Embassy for the Kapini Primary School, and \$10,000 from Zambia's Provincial Planning Department for the new Lubanga Road and Bridge. The web of consultant expertise expands as 20 visits are made to the Project this week for funding, roofing, geological surveying and irrigation analysis.

Internal: Ben Becker, Civil Engineer, receives Institute work permit and arrives in time to direct the Lubanga Road and Bridge construction.

Contradiction: Shifting to monthly allowance base without damaging volunteer spirit of community. (Wk. 11)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Marathon workday (6 a.m.—12 midnight) finishes water pipe to tank site, under village generalship, and broad participation of village. Government requests that ten men be assigned to Project for training in methods.

Internal: June 30th committee meeting highlighted by decision to invite Bedoin tribes to race their camels against village camels.

Contradiction: Bird-dogging events to completion corporately. (Wk. 2)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Tuesday night Kawangware Leadership Meeting becomes time of reflection and vision as grieving local man sees the gift of both the life and death of their great leader and a way to move that greatness into the future. Guardian dynamic manifests itself with assistance given in securing work permit and passport. Site visit from Rotary releases interest in earth block house. The visitor is related to Housing Finance Corporation of Kenya.

Internal: Nicholas Kisumba arrives from Kamweleni to participate in Farm Training Program for three months . . . the first from outside Kawangware.

Contradiction: Being self-conscious and not entrenched in disabling patterns without seeing a way to move beyond them. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: The Kamweleni people are invited to join the official Machakos delegation to pay their last respects to Mzee Jomo Kenyatta by invitation of the District Officer. A representative of each stake, along with HDP staff, begin their trek to Nairobi at 4:30 a.m., crossing the river on foot. The delegation has the awesome and historic experience of filing past the body of the founder of the nation. The event is reported back to the community and is held to be a sign of the emerging role of Kamweleni in the Machakos area.

Internal: All staff travel, through in-kind transportation to Kawangware for Area Council where areal maneuvers are planned in response to global consensus, news from GRA and Global Priors Council.

Contradiction: Overcoming the tendency to operate programmatically, rather than strategically. (Wk. 11)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: Race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Centrum. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: House hosts first Project Directors' Meeting of the year. Ninety around the table, including newly assigned national support forces, plan *Betting on Victory* campaign.

Internal: Emerging Generation captures the attention of all with arrival of Michelle Marie Anela Balm, daughter of Desmond and Liz Balm, born August 5th and the celebration of David Secunder Patterson's first birthday.

Contradiction: Orchestrating a do-ment campaign amidst launching a new round of 20 HDPs. (Wk. 11)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Vinay Jacob, Vivian Paul and Maxine Butcher attend project directors meeting in Bombay. Jane Coe plans with House for a shramdan (workday) in Madangir. Global Language School starts in St. Paul's School.

Internal: New songbooks bring back new spirit and Order memory.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers to intensify the mission and keep troops busy on the road in the midst of heavy rains. (Wk. 7)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: The first translation of the State Cooperative Society by-laws are translated into simple Telegu by Nadlapur HDP, ten charkas (wool-spinning machines) are produced and put to use, and new rope making machines are painted. Development and Medical officers consent and sanction a full-time nurse and health sub-station for Nadlapur. UST agrees to help market raise 60,000 rupees worth of wheat for use in the completion of the two kilometer Nadlapur approach road.

Internal: The auxiliary garden is fenced, ten new lime and four flowering trees are planted to enhance new auxiliary house, which is now complete. Mali and Pat Balm return to the Project with the Wards.

Contradiction: Re-orienting the Project auxiliary staff to see a common vision after a summer of discontinuity. (Wk. 11)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Local women take responsibility for the next GWF to be held at the Calcutta Swimming Club.

Internal: Conversation on GWF montage creates refreshing context for the final lap of recruitment.

Contradiction: Revitalizing internal structures to bring off GWF in the midst of preparing for and having crucial meeting with potential sponsor of the first Eastern India HDP. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Nexus participates in Singapore Area Council which creates comprehensive and significant new model for Area, such as new grids, decisions to do massive Town Meeting, and experimentation with Project phasing.

Internal: The Harpers' arrival, celebrated with a dinner given by travel agent, pushes the House into the New Year.

Contradiction: Planning Nexus Maneuvers for all three areas in the midst of the tension between Band disbursement and the need for corporate Nexus planning. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: All four stakes launch workdays: building a grandstand to the football field, creating two new bus stops and organizing a stake clean-up. The Project ferro-cement industry receives its first orders to build rice silos for the State Rice Board. Health Caretaker training is completed for 13 women with a trip to Queen Elizabeth Hospital.

Internal: Project is visited by Guardian couple from Kuala Lumpur who report on great GWF.

Contradiction: Achieving an immediate win in the middle of a multitude of long-range possibilities. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Demonstration plot is re-plowed for experimenting with cash crops of ginger, chili, onions and ground nuts.

Internal: Area Priors Council forecasts establishing the six sensational regions into a shiny band, golding the area, using powerful symbology with training for directorship as well as formalizing the Guardian net, exploding the possibilities of local permeation and doubling the global Development.

Contradiction: Converting the Hari Raya Spell (discontinuity) into life engagement. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Victory! New chicken industry sells first 400 eggs (from the first of three stake chicken houses) to buyer who will take up to 10,500 weekly. Powerful regional/project maneuver planning for 78-79 takes one day, not three weeks as before.

Internal: House welcomes Cocks, sends out Nurul to Bayad via Maliwada HDTs and Atack and Soedarno to Bontoa.

Contradiction: Configuring staff and village for three campaigns in two regions and hitting the road. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House continues metro circuiting to recruit HDP auxiliaries for area, and attends dinner at the American Consulate, set up to introduce the ICA to other community development people. House continues visits with ITI grads and struggles with long and short range intentions of HDP in relation to Indonesian pancasila (creed).

Internal: Translating ecclesiola manual allows both House and guests to struggle with what it means to know, do, and be profound humanness. Celebrative meal out in Medan Fair restaurant marks common sense that we really know how we are going to do it and is felt by all.

Contradiction: Keeping pace going while nearly whole House is required for Sabah Consult. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO

External: Bontoa HDP Consult is set for October 8—14.

Internal: New assignments mark the beginning of a new project in the region.

Contradiction: Getting assigned troops on location to begin consult preparation and local framing. (Wk. 7)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: House sends out Jim Oberg to Manila to continue the Development push there while resettlement continues with Barbara Scott and the Jenkins ticketed and on their way to India.

Internal: Entire Nexus participates in "painting party" in which the office, halls, three bedrooms and kitchen receive new life.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between patient waiting and effective preparation. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Appointments, structures and summer program continue in the midst of tropical storm, Agnes. HDP Center comes alive with typing and guitar practice during stormy week.

Internal: First House packet arrives with GRA materials and "Those Who Have Eyes" paper is eagerly studied, followed by a reflective conversation on the past year.

Contradiction: Creating Phase II model and preparing the village for staff departure in the midst of troop disbursement, change of assignments and all kinds of weather. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Five villagers, the pre-school teacher, and two county officials depart for Sudtonggan (the first trip out of the country for all but one).

Internal: House sends out summer sojourner, Colon, to begin his first teaching job.

Contradiction: Discerning the baby steps that will add up to a giant step of accomplishment. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: House continues working toward fruition of two HDP funding proposals.

Internal: Gross income earned in July from teaching English totals a record \$1,000 (USD), helps buoy annual passage over summer financial shoals, and explains why the remnant saw so little of each other.

Contradiction: Keeping minds on the comprehensive as it is, while wondering how it will change. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: New ICA sign goes up near the House giving directions to drivers. Metro group studies *Christ of History* every Tuesday night.

Internal: LaRoche's, on their way to Korea, celebrate their first anniversary of marriage at House Church and Pamela Macomber celebrates her 31st year.

Contradiction: Connecting the powerful motivity generated on the Hai Ou villagers trip to Sudtonggan with the task in Taiwan Quarter II. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Sow and piglet arrive. W.H.O. Asian regional director visits. Fourteen hundred pieces of Sudtonggan rock are delivered for Cebu Shopping Center. Road beautification project is begun in the midst of rumors of possible visit by First Lady Imelda Marcos.

Internal: House participates in a week of surprises as two visitors drop in. Russ Wheelock of Kansas City on a GSD tour and Tom Gould, both of whom report on India.

Contradiction: Operating in Week 9 as if the community models that the Yearly Planning Sessions create during Week 12 already existed. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Two thousand giant ipil-ipil are planted along the road by Bureau of Soil employees and Langub people; first delivery of charcoal is made to Durano; and city PopCom office sponsors a movie.

Internal: The week is highlighted by a study of summer speeches.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and corporateness while waiting for new staff. (Wk. 10)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: New area prior family, the Clarks, are on their first trek.

Internal: The Jon Jenkins family leave Tokyo House for Sri Lanka.

Contradiction: Creating missional priorities while waiting for Area Council. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Kwangyung Training Center hosts an overnight Christian Scout Jamboree for 70 youth and adults as the new Jeju-do Troop is initiated. Kwangyung II Ri leaders lease the Trading Post to a village manager. The village leaders hold sendout celebration for Lee Jae Joon and family.

Internal: Lee Jae Joön family leaves for Seoul as new sojourner, Kim Kyung Hee arrives.

Contradiction: Struggling with ways to allow villagers to assume complete responsibility for this Project. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Two village workdays build cement block forms, line drainage ditch with large rocks, clear land for piggery foundation, and complete village store inventory. In Seoul, Consult document in Korean is given to printer, and Development calls continue. Village buys chairs for community hall with funds from the village treasury.

Internal: House welcomes Art Rowe family enroute from Hong Kong Nexus to GRA.

Contradiction: Fighting five crucial battles on widely scattered terrain with one platoon. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House schedules for Quarter II a Town Meeting (Shiiki Kon Dan Kai), a GYF, and an HRM in Naha Father Dwyer from Nagasaki requests a 400 man Town Meeting.

Internal: Hansons arrive and student helper Mitsuko Kawasaki is located.

Contradiction: Creating a strategic plan and image of maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: House experiences the engagement of both the secular and the religious sectors as Guardians affirm role of LENS and advise on preparations for November seminar and Miss Satuki Okouchi comes to House Church with Rev. Nishihara before leaving for Oyubari summer training program.

Internal: Emerging Generation summer program, *Japan Jets*, takes off with seven E.G. from Tokyo and Osaka Houses, plus one from colleague family preparing their "village" spaces and building community.

Contradiction: Exposing the spirit dimension of the doing. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: In-kind trip to Sapporo nets items for summer program. Visiting and planning with local leaders pulls final details for August together (work projects, stake visiting, elders meeting, etc.). Facility preparation continues full force to prepare for work camps and volunteers.

Internal: House sends out Terry Bergdall to Global Prior's Council.

Contradiction: Implementing strategies for maximum community participation while pulling it all together for a great August. (Wk. 6)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Ten days of geographical coverage in one week revitalizes old contacts on Sector Spooof Maneuver. Forty gallons of paint are in-kind for Murrin Bridge Adopt-A-House Maneuver. Mark Mitchell, Oombulgurri citizen, tells the Project's story on three fifteen-minute radio programs.

Internal: House receives elated Buddy Witton enroute from GRA in Chicago to the Murrin Bridge HDP.

Contradiction: Building momentum that places incoming assignees on death ground. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: House receives \$350, \$300 from an individual we have never talked with, holds 13 Community Meetings and prepares State Assembly and CTC mailing as great Year of Australia event.

Internal: Jennifer Ross is sent out to Canada; youth lead collegiums; Neil's team wins basketball Grand Final.

Contradiction: Turning tension of Area Council assignments and regional priorities into victories for both. (Wk.10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: All community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50 lbs. baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of their own responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Regional workshop results in 30 people assigned to task forces for implementing the Year of Australia, following a fine Area Council.

Internal: Whole House participates in Area Council and returns to celebrate Brown's arrival and the presence of John Burbidge enroute from India to Perth with a sumptuous Indian meal.

Contradiction: Meshing regional task forces in maneuvers that push the whole mission forward for the Year of Australia. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Owen Bull from Lake Tyers joins House delegation to Area Council. Pre-council blitz yields \$1006 cash in hand plus 25 kilos of rice, 24 kg. margarine and two cases of peanut paste.

Internal: House receives Owen Bull as sojourner and celebrates return from Council with fish and chips.

Contradiction: Forging the models that enable doing what the body has decided to do. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Australian Development Assistance Bureau (NGO) approves ICA eligible for funding in the midst of hosting GSD maneuver building with five aborigines participating from

three different communities.

Internal: Preparations move quickly to shift Nexus procedures to Sidney with Barry Oakley and Margie Tomlinson on site to work through Development and Management monitoring. House is full of youth on holiday and all is bubbling.

Contradiction: Phasing next steps in the Year of Australia on sunshine. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: House sends John to Sydney to plan for Area Council. Clark visits aboriginal community leader and sets up a community meeting for October.

Internal: House holds Year of Australia Fast and Regional Party.

Contradiction: Doing what we plan to do while feeling we could be doing more. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: Week II team from Sydney helps community residents paint two houses. Seventy tons of aggregate hauled for industrial shed and walkways. Walkabout team of five is sent out to Wilcanna for CMA.

Internal: Fasting and feasting abound, as brooding turns toward Area Council planning and the launching of the Year of Australia.

Contradiction: Keeping the "spring" in the tension. (Wk. 10)

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: TASC team is on ship, which helps move the Bikini people to Kili and supports this move by selling food.

Internal: Begin "spring" cleaning in the fall to prepare house for planning and Metro Council this month.

Contradiction: Determining the real direction of the future while experiencing political "freedom" for the first time in a hundred years. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA**

External: Cruciality of HDP for rural Western Samoa villages is vocalized by project director of Meth's Plantation.

Internal: House is impacted by tour to two sides of the island while seeing village life.

Contradiction: Scheduling village visits and site selection with a model that engages local colleagues. (Wk. 10)

**SAN FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: With short timeline for planning, Area Council comes off as miraculous event including impressive colleague participation.

Internal: Area Council is highlighted by in-kind miracles and the first and last annual Autumn Olympics.

Contradiction: Launching the maneuver in the midst of the void of "to do's". (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: First Richgrove Fair nets \$700 for Community Center Park and baseball diamond; rabies clinic vaccinates 88 dogs; third newsletter distributed; CETA framing and proposal writing opens more government doors in Tulare County.

Internal: House hosts guests from Cusick and Mill Shoals Consults, Nam Wai HDP, sojourners and Development team.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of neighborhood participation as guilds "cover the waterfront" in several directions. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP**

External: Welcome Wagon holds its first meeting.

Internal: All staff travel to San Francisco for Area Council.

Contradiction: Enabling task groups and leadership to take responsibility for community tasks. (Wk.11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Lockman family returns from weekend of work and celebration in Cusick; Rev. Warren Crain visits Cusick for the first of three work projects demonstrating regional support for HDP.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Six months of planning for the California HDP culminates in active involvement of surprising number of new and old colleagues from Los Angeles Region in HDP set-up and consultation alongside Richgrove citizens.

Internal: Bob Vance reports on Richgrove, grounding the story, the reality and commitment to HDPs.

Contradiction: Using Richgrove to advantage as a visible demonstration to increase the momentum and focus the Los Angeles region. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY**

External: Long-distance Consult prep becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food, household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with ordering, cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

Internal: All assigned to house are now on board and support from the local begins with one job secured.

Contradiction: Getting ourselves in position to create the appropriate maneuvers as new troops with limited information accessibility. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP**

External: Mark Jewel reveals unlimited possibility to Day Care teachers with spin on Delta Pace and other Project preschools. Seven guests in Inyan Wakagapi this week give local leaders the opportunity to tell the miracle of the Project again and again.

Internal: House decides to move Religious House to new location and leave old house as Project office.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between internal life and the global mission. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Thursday night 'metro meeting with ten present results in Saturday workday with metro colleagues inking window glass and \$50 worth of paint for house.

Internal: House doubles in size with the arrival of Steve Hamje, Shawne Stewart, and Pat Goad while freezer size more than doubles with arrival of 60 inked steaks.

Contradiction: Shifting brooding on the role of Denver Religious House in a very mature region. (Wk. 10)

**EDMONTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: The Area's decision to start on the saturation strongholds in the most remote region—the Northwest Territories—is empowered by securing four names for the brochure and getting the introductory mailing sent.

Internal: House is opened after Summer with food procuring, re-decoring, and workshops on Area Council.

Contradiction: Moving House systems before leaving again on Area maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP**

External: Proposal for purchase of the Community Store by local couple is submitted to ARDA. Auxiliary spends long weekend in Edmonton at Area Council. Vogar leadership development continues as Vogar Products operates on their own for two weeks. Vogar resident spends two days in Winnipeg researching Vogar Woodworks.

#### **(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP)**

Internal: Religious House demonstration moves onward as linoleum is laid in collegium room, new lounge is created, and guest/auxiliary rooms are all refurbished.

Contradiction: Focusing limited troops on necessary village tasks while positioning ourselves for new program year with councils and maneuver planning. (Wk. 10)

### **HOUSTON**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Two Project mayors, nine participants from three HDPs, and 35 colleagues impact Area Council at Texas Southern University.

Internal: All priors participating in Area Council planning experience awe and wonder at gridding and budgets.

Contradiction: Maintaining balance during shift in emphasis from areas and counties to regions and micros and pulling together pivotal city, saturation and development into one thrust. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP**

External: \$105,000 HUD grant is approved to build a new water tower. Openijg of Community Center begins with band playing, Mayor P.J. Stoll receiving the Center keys, and showing of the movie *Jason and the Argonauts*. Linwood UMC from Oklahoma City spends weekend cleaning lot for playground in the rain.

Internal: House moves to new rent-free facility and works on inside renovation.

External: House plans Summer 78 celebration and send out to lift up Asherton and Indiahoma Consults and assignments shifts.

Internal: House gets a much needed face-lift as Adkinsons mysteriously show up to paint first floor.

Contradiction: Objectifying the wisdom gathered from last year's victory so that new eyes can appropriate it quickly and move into the new year. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: Auxiliary and community representatives attend Area Council, clarifying Pace's role in area and regional maneuvers for the coming year.

Internal: Housecleaning and resettlement prepares House for new year's thrust.

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Guardian catalyzes possibility for 100 new jobs in Asherton with broom and mop company subsidiary industry.

Internal: House accomplishes the great move into a new facility, symbolized by first House Church in just set up collegium room with total youth cluster present as well as key colleagues.

Contradiction: Focusing the quarter with priorities and maneuvers in the midst of continuing to meet overwhelming facility set-up demands. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Pace and Memphis lead second training workshop for Mississippi social services agency people and leave with appointment set with Governor Finch's assistants to present proposal for TM saturation in Mississippi. Richard Butler sends Arkansas Report with personal note to Governor Pryor.

Internal: Colleagues invited to Area Council using Sears WATS lines.

Contradiction: Winning by using the grid's gifts along with two years of field experience. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Whole House attends Area Council and participates in regridding the region. House receives \$1000 in the mail from regional colleague.

Internal: Self-support workshop enables House to see how it is possible to meet the budget while looking for jobs.

Contradiction: Putting practical form behind regional consensus. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: Labor Day parade and fun day draws crowd of 5,000 including 50 dignitaries, shifts the image of Gibson in the county, strengthens authorization and builds new community confidence.

Internal: Internal life is punctuated by beginning of school for youth, visits by John Ryan, Gene Humphries, Rodney Foster family, Robert Dexter family and Bill Bingham and sending of staff to Area Council in Houston.

Contradiction: Charting the victorious community momentum for Phase III. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: All five House members attend Area Council in Houston, plan maneuvers for the quarter and begin the process of building a missional unit for an expanded Florida region.

Internal: The House is located temporarily in a two-bedroom apartment, youth are enrolled in the nearby school, and one full-time job begins.

Contradiction: Relating space, time and story to a common, motivating vision of the task. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

Internal: First Nexus House meeting is held as an experiment in increased interchange between Centrums.

Contradiction: Warring of diffused priorities raises individual anxieties and saps missional effectiveness. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Many Fifth City citizens attend GRA sessions, and GRA visits Fifth City; \$35,000 assured for Elders Action Center; model for summer use of recreation center created, with task force taking charge.

Internal: Headmistress of Woburn Lawn school spends weekend with Lela Mosley; House welcomes Helen Eskridge, Ed Miller and Lela Mosley back from Latin American Consults.

Contradiction: Maintaining a focused time design that will allow significant Council participation, while sustaining on-going project momentum. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP**

External: Project community sees itself as totally responsible for securing auxiliary housing and contacts local priest for facility.

Internal: House travels to San Francisco for Area Council and teams up with Phoenix House to win first annual Area San Francisco Olympics.

Contradiction: Discerning tactical engagement amidst the three major maneuvers—self support, pre-Consult prep and Regional Council—each with conflicting demands on time and troops. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: A week of coming and going as seven return from weekend at GRA; and visit to Fifth City; youth gather at 5:30 a.m. each morning to meet detasseling contract with Pioneer Seed Company; first guild meeting launches five guilds, while plans are created for stake float in Watermelon Day Parade at first stake meeting.

Internal: Visitors flood through, making global collegueship a reality, with impromptu Indian feast for community and House capping the week.

Contradiction: Creating leadership training models to turn willing helpers into confident leaders. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Metro focuses on Woodard-Ziegenhorn wedding preparation. The Wichita metro has its first meeting since the House moved to Arizona.

Internal: Fall House facility preparation for hosting wedding guests includes much needed repairs to chimney, roof and external appearance.

Contradiction: Forming a regional dynamic. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Regional Council is held with all metros represented and about 40 participants. Maneuvers are built and the regional glue structures are created through the yearly, quarterly and weekly time designs, writing of the regional song and a statement of the movemental covenant.

Internal: Ecclesiola focuses on *The New Reality*, using the talk on *The Immediacy of Fulfilled Living*.

Contradiction: Sustaining activity and discipline required to move majestically from the articulated maneuvers to the yearly implementation. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Visit with Community Participation Advisory Commission in St. Charles indicates saturation prospects in January.

Internal: House and regional colleague family spends week transforming lounge into elegant collegium room.

Contradiction: Bracketing what needs to wait until next week. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Great signs focus spirit engagement as mural begins, third flower box has flowers in and paint/bake sale nets over \$150. Community elder sparks impromptu picnic with 35 attending.

Internal: House accelerates visibility as Mill Shoals T-shirts travel around the world to Saudi Arabia and Amy Carter.

Contradiction: Opening the community's eyes to the great accomplishments that are occurring. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: Four Kinney residents join House at Minneapolis Regional Council, where region is re-captured after 18 months of state campaigns. Retreat dynamic at meals allows for personal reflection.

Internal: House and community person in Duluth on Family Night see movie and have dinner together.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum, planning, and training going after explosion of workday. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Twenty-four house members and bi-metro colleagues, including a couple with no previous contact, tour Fifth City and participate in workshop on contradictions facing the Milwaukee neighborhoods, then celebrate at Diana's Restaurant.

Internal: Timely inked gifts of fruit and vegetables and an influx of Order youth and sojourners enable the canning and freezing of food to keep the troops on their feet and moving into and through the next quarter.

Contradiction: Beginning a fantastic new year with veteran colleagues who are so clear about both the glory and the pain involved in concretizing the victories of the year. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Metro cadres begin to get excited about the coming year as they look at the global priorities and their local implications, name the present advantages, and choose key events for the kick-off of the new season. Outstate trip gets two more GSFs in the works in addition to the September one for which GWF tickets are now being sold by the host committee.

Internal: All nine from the House go to Area Council where the opportunity to work as a region in maneuver building pushes to new depths the consensus of the summer on the global priorities.

Contradiction: Building the format for Metro Council that will elicit excitement for the coming year and offer engagement to each person without the overwhelmedness of the seemingly vast and endless possibilities. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Regional colleagues meet in Hamilton, Ohio, to frame pilot saturation stronghold and later meet in Cincinnati to frame the entire three year saturation campaign for Ohio.

Internal: Eighteen regional colleagues join the House for Ten Year Celebration with cake, champagne, art form conversation, Rip Van Winkle skit, singing and waltzing.

Contradiction: Getting a comprehensive actuation plan completed that assures do-ment of all facets of the task. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Council participants meet to rehearse maneuver building methodology in preparation for Guild's Quarter II maneuver workshop. Town Meeting campaign receives check in mail from Sears, Detroit group, for \$300 and readies cars for circuits.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT)**

Internal: House completes necessary construction on in-kind facility and symbolizes the year's new game with in-kind seats at Lions' pre-season opening football game.

Contradiction: Naming the immediate victory that claims the new year for the entire region. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: East Side stronghold moves into full swing with micros targeted, troops assigned and first five Town Meetings set up.

Internal: Chicago Area Council highlighted by maneuvers and a new regional emphasis.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the pre-stronghold strategies in all metros. (Wk. 10)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Maneuvers are written at the Area Council which allow the regional colleagues and House to stand before a dread-filled future with confidence. Permeators meet to plan their employment maneuvers with metro colleagues.

Internal: House hosts Area Council with 150 attending and serves 1200 meals, highlighted by an in-kind six foot long hero sandwich.

Contradiction: Creating rational and poetic designs for the House which reflect the maneuvers and permit new images of the Religious House to emerge which will enable the completion of the maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Metro participates in the dynamic of GRA: reports and research.

Internal: Area data gathering reminds us of care and accountability.

Contradiction: Articulating activity of programs as profound humanness so that formulated region sees itself filling all GSF roles. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Area Council releases the region to deal with Quarter II when signal cluster model is printed and areal and regional maneuvers are written, while standing present to the New Reality.

Internal: House celebrates its beginnings with ice cream and cake Tuesday night. Area decor implemented Wednesday night and ecclesiola Thursday night.

Contradiction: Creating enabling visual images to rehearse one mission in midst of Town Meeting and self-support emphases. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: The entire House participates in Prior's Council while new sojourner holds down the homefront.

Internal: House members return from Global Prior's Council and Phase I camp, and one permeator receives \$100 per week raise.

Contradiction: Communicating the excitement, enthusiasm and historical significance of the GCF campaign to regional colleagues. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Regionalis is key as Saturday is spent in reworking Washington D.C. regional grid with colleagues from Baltimore and Richmond and then celebrating the summer

and the coming year with metro briefing Saturday night.

Internal: House hosts youth group from Cleveland here to work in Ivy City, receives Mike Rush enroute to Isle of Dogs and sends out Sherri Rozenthal to North Carolina.

Contradiction: Moving from the discontinuous summer rhythm to building comprehensive weekly maneuvers that anticipate the next quarter. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: First West Virginian TM participant attends Area Council.

Internal: School starts for the Youth Cluster with high excitement and no study halls.

Contradiction: Doing the doing which builds consensus rather than conflict. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Area Council Briefing Night involves 15 old and new colleagues of strong leadership potential in the targeting of the region's 12 saturation strongholds.

Internal: Area Council emphasis on saturation brings forth new ways to engage metro colleagues including, in the arena of regional House empowerment, plans for a Living Environment Odyssey to recreate house space.

Contradiction: Using metro colleagues to help House rapidly get on top of regional turf on the other side of 18 months of areal focus. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: The first permeators meeting in the New York Area is held at the Area Council, pointing to the seriousness with which self-support will be dealt with in the coming year.

Internal: The image of Dr. Lao's circus tent points to the Wayside Inn dynamic role played by the New York regional House in hosting 150 people for the Area Council.

Contradiction: Creating rational and poetic designs of the House that reflect the art of maneuver and permit new images of the Religious House to emerge that allow the task to be accomplished. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Starks residents attend New York Area Council and give Starks HDP report.

Internal: Youth Cluster arrives and Wendy Rose begins permeation in Farmington.

Contradiction: Focusing Project direction through related events. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Regional meeting in Boston enables consensus on the regional grid and initiates thinking about the placement of the saturation strongholds.

Internal: Regional celebration in Brockton, Massachusetts at Paul LaVie's is a grand time for all.

Contradiction: Diving into the year, internally, before Area Council, in order to continue depth brooding and to enable full participation at the Council. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Project meeting celebrates the arrival of the Consult documents.

Internal: The Spirit Movement sings to the world in the Staten Island Ferry terminal.

Contradiction: Broadening the maneuver ground beyond the core of active supporters. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: All day regional planning event reveals new dimensions for enlisting colleague engagement.

Internal: House and regional colleagues attend fall reception and kick-off celebration at Paul Le Vie's home in Brockton, Massachusetts.

Contradiction: Collecting data for possible saturation strongholds in turf we have not been in for two years. (Wk. 10)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Completion of polis grids for Regions Montreal and Quebec confirm that *Night at the Institute* guests represent three targeted metro strongholds. Labor Day's labors are spent in Montreal urban saturation project, researching its six parishes.

Internal: Major fire in adjacent 2400 block of Ste. Catherine St. comes within two buildings of the Religious House while residents, in faith, continue to paint and clean in preparation for *Night at the Institute* the following day.

Contradiction: Focusing on a way to keep the numerous saturation possibilities from slipping away. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: House and regional colleagues initiate the first HDP site selection trip in the densely populated heartland of Ontario.

Internal: Movement colleagues are mobilized in House search and guest list grows for every house event as colleagues call up house and invite themselves over.

Contradiction: Moving at high speed with three campaigns while creating the Religious House presence. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Twelve regional colleagues gather at House to mark beginning of New Year. Saturation enthusiasm is present.

Internal: House is renovated and redecored with inkind carpet, paint and curtains.

Contradiction: Uncertainty over New Day Canada requirements in New Brunswick creates hesitancy in committing ourselves regionally. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Seventy-one junk cars are hauled away from the community and two mobile classrooms for the education center arrive in a week of intensified struggle for community leadership to assume responsibility for Project by being board members of LEDC, LHDP, and Credit Union. New Day Canada teams plant seeds for network participation in Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island.

Internal: House visits historic Acadian village and participates in preparation for new Stringham baby by building a new room and attending a baby shower given by the community.

Contradiction: Managing many fronts and all supply systems at once. (Wk. 11)

**CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Visits from Maryknoll, Guatemalan military attache and two key Guardians highlight visibility of the Project. Industry increases sale of dresses and receives order for a new style at higher price. Leadership meeting lists qualities of leadership and prioritizes three directions for the coming year: water to the houses, plaza, and chapel.

Internal: Borrowed TORO (rotary lawnmower), named *the machine of the thousand machetes*, creates lawn space out of the jungle. Daily Office and War Room are created and initiated.

Contradiction: Including village leadership in comprehensive planning. (Wk. 11)

**BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Formation of leadership core in evening meeting for training, context expansion and problem solving adds momentum to guild activity. Alcalde mayor visits with wife and community social worker and stays three hours and discusses many ideas and offers insights on project plans.

Internal: Larger collegium room for additional people in evening leadership meeting is created by moving auxiliary staff rooms and personnel.

Contradiction: Forming new groups quadruples logistics and catches us unprepared for expanded enblement. (Wk. 10)

**RIO DE JANEIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Health Clinic operating on regular schedule; preschool with two community teachers opens; collapsed bridge repaired; Phase One implementation plan completed and begun.

Internal: Restructuring of internal life for quarter enables auxiliary; Jim Campbell is sent out to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Moving busy community to new levels of engagement. (Wk. 4)

**HAVANA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: The community celebrates a week of solid foundations as the groundbreaking ceremony for the new preschool building is held, the first major supply of lumber for the furniture industry is unloaded, and the preschool T-shirts arrive.

Internal: The House and community send out Mr. J.S. Dethle by celebrating Indian Independence Day with an Indian feast and Jamaican dancing.

Contradiction: Spending nine hours on the bus to have a five hour day in Kingston. (Wk. 10)

**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Translation of Document completed and sent to typist; drinking water now available to entire village after repairs were made to pump; plaza is transformed with white rocks and huge Turn Symbol painted on the side of the water tank.

Internal: Auxiliary organized in teams for the actuation of the project.

Contradiction: Finding the method to get water from the river to irrigate the small farms of the people of Conacaste. (Wk. 4)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports framing visit with John Garnet, head of Industrial Society in U.K., is promising for support of ICA. Last minute windfalls of \$20,000 from an individual, \$25,000 from Mulsen Foundation in Canada, and signing HUD contract for \$80,000 enable August closing at \$226,000. Quarter II maneuver planning exposes many new targets for funding old and new projects and programs. New orbits in framing signal expanded funding potential for projects and programs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of establishing a system for movement on multinational corporation priorities.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Singapore focuses on preparation for mobile training school in SEAPAC. ITI grad recommends in writing that all religious in West Africa attend the ITI. Chicago completes *The Journal* while is sent for printing and binding. Collegiums and reports concerning the development of the HDTs allows the Research Centrum to function as a truly global band. The key contradiction lies in the arena of bringing focus to the training demands and faculty assignments for Quarter II.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the completion of Quarter II maneuvers. Signal events are a health trek to Woburn Lawn, Global Women's Forum in Lorimor HDP and visit from Brian Smith, returning from working in three projects. A new role for Global Operations Centrum is emerging as the Centrum forges out models that anticipate and inform the future beyond the immediate pressures of the field maneuvers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of refining the quarter's timeline in order to focus engagement and put weekly urgencies in perspective.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Brussels yearly maneuvers in the theatres of global audit, Order finance, commonization, Project capital monitoring and legal finesse. Singapore reports arrival of Harpers, enabling continuity of management as Stanleys depart for Apia. Chicago has fine module of Week II task forces and plans the Centrum space. Getting new models and designs for the quarter and year in place turns Centrum forward rather than backward. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unprioritized immediate demands delaying corporate brooding and action on long-range constructs and models.
