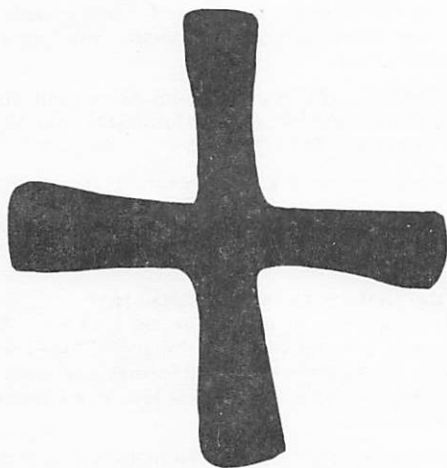


THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

WEEK TEN

DECEMBER 3-DECEMBER 9



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The first week of metro circuits nets two "sets" set, one each in the London and Oxford metros.

Internal: Five Indonesians pay a visit, as well as two new Island families.

Contradiction: Finding a way to celebrate the chaos of overwhelming issues and accelerating external demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional colleague, David Fleming, says, "yes" to ICA speaking engagement. Sister Mary Agnes, a Glasgow Sister, calls to arrange Youth Forum meeting.

Internal: House budget rapidly improves with new job and other incomes.

Contradiction: Pushing the self-support victory to all the other arenas. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Meetings with two building contractors break loose the possibility of laying the foundation for the community building before Christmas. Ninety community residents turn out for a meeting with County Council representatives and National Coal Board officials to discuss the future of mining near Tai'rgwaith. A village welcome sign in Welsh and English is erected by a nearby business.

Internal: A two day visit by the Area Strike Force releases new possibility for the community building, pushes Town Meeting plans to a new level and occasions new relationship to finances.

Contradiction: Turning the internal momentum of fund raising and TM scheduling into external accomplishments during the month of December. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Youth Forums through education structures and eries of events through social services structures open new era of secular establishment trust.

And all the time the Lord went before them, by day a pillar of cloud to guide them on their journey, by night a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel night and day. The pillar of cloud never left its place in front of the people by day, nor the pillar of fire by night.

Internal: Double jobbing gives way of meeting budget.

Contradiction: Using all troop potential to meet all missional needs. (Wk. 10)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Madrid House visits mountain town outside Granada on last day of 15 day trip which nets 75 solid contacts and visit 35 villages and towns. House has breakopen call with *Campaign Against Hunger* in Madrid! They support 400 projects in Latin America, India and Africa as well as Spain.

Internal: John Bazill lands first job of Madrid House and translates Town Meeting materials with Patricia Maquire (She:la's sister).

Contradiction: Deciding which of the first priorities (on road, jobs, housing, visits and materials translation) is first. (Wk. 9)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: TM in Forsac with one-third of the population catalyzes realization that a set is more than a series of Town Meetings.

Internal: Feast of Thanksgiving ecclesiola with Earthrise study allows House to struggle anew with myths and the fast.

Contradiction: Concretizing training in set formation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Visit to Amsterdam by Professor Fabian Udekwu, Vice-President of ICA Nigeria, raises \$.5 million for CHAN Pharm project and secures ICA Overseas Secretary salary for Brussels Nexus.

Internal: Professor Udekwu occasions profound spirit conversation around Ecclesiola table.

Contradiction: Wheels which go uphill as easily as downhill. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Urban set in Gent guest worker neighborhood starts with big local set-up meeting.

Internal: Open House catalyzes new House decor.

Contradiction: Discerning way to link Gent set to regional formulation. (Wk. 6)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP**

External: First full week of Cassa Panca marketing nets 16 visits in eight locations and clarifies direction of industry product marketing. House deposits 3,400,000 Lire in new centrum ICA account with 600,000 Lire working.

Internal: President of cooperative visits House and attends Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Breaking loose a way to secure orders and letters of intent to provide foundation for industry capitalization. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP**

External: Demonstration Town Meeting in Mushin (the urban of urban Lagos) is a resounding success with 44 present doing the Town Meeting then reflecting on the method, in preparation for eight Town Meetings in various communities of Mushin on 23rd October.

Internal: House in-kinds use of TV and generator to watch ceremony of the launching of the Second Republic of Nigeria (transition from military to civilian rule) celebrated on Nigerian Independence Day, October 1.

Contradiction: Building the Development structures in the area, and the Management structures in the village to cope with the monumental projects involved in transition. (Wk. 7)

DOUALA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA**

External: Nigerian professor agrees to open up channels to Ivory Coast.

Internal: House celebrates coming together after four weeks of being dispersed.

Contradiction: Moving specifically without restricting options. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Evening at the Institute is held at House with 17 colleagues and new acquaintances in attendance to hear report on Kenya with slides given by Johannes Bruckner and Harry Janssen. Colleagues help with enablement and tour House during show. Two registrations for Christmas trek follow within two days.

Internal: House discovers the power of the facility in telling the movement story.

Contradiction: Taking time to pull together and train self-conscious movement so that limited resources expand to fill the program opportunities available. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Fifty selling stalls and a special edition of the *Latene* mark the momentum of Christmas market. Phone call from colleague in Vienna announces a scheduled GWF. Linn Cary calls on Social Welfare official in Neukolln and receives an offer to participate in any program needed to be done there.

Internal: Area prior and Management team presence allow new burst of corporate power on the limited liability company, cafe strategy, and quarter plans.

Contradiction: Translating the momentum of single events into continuing structures. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Exciting collegium and evening battleplanning session on the form of awakening for the Netherlands context three calls in two different Metros which net new set possibilities.

Internal: Self-support for a year seems assured with good call on Labor Bureau and inroads for Housework into American Women's Club and Embassy staff.

Contradiction: Expanding image of care for nation to care for two (transrational) Regions. (Wk. 10)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP**

External: Village Forum Team II arrives back from Solwezi (Kitwe Metro) with the victory of doing 20 Village Forums in two weeks, bringing the total to 40 Forums in 40 weeks. The *Twenty Acres* farm crew reports that 15 acres are cleared and ready for plowing.

Internal: House gathers with representatives from each stake to plan the state DOOP model.

Contradiction: Keeping community momentum flowing when family plowing must be done. (Wk. 9)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Three year celebration, a great week-long event in itself with stake story and symbol workshops, two nights of cinema, and 100 cases of in-kind Pepsi sets tone for nothing less than victory as procurement team successfully wrestles desert pipe through paperwork, final "yes" is said to land permission for desert project and the school receives piped water from the Bayad system.

Internal: Telling the Bayad story while hosting visitors on walking tours of the village impresses both visitors and staff with the miracle Bayad is.

Contradiction: Guiding the Community Development Association through a minefield of ancient prejudices to a position where it can benefit from the new openness of the Social Affairs Department. (Wk. 8)

NAIROBI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: NORAD come through in two days with grant from discretionary fund. Power of local man is demonstrated in Kabiro in various forms. Mzee Mwaura participates in Identity Systems panel of HDTI and gets great response from students. Housing committee in Kabiro selects housing plan to go with for the future. Kabiro committee plans and implements workday on community center. Health caretakers complete first aid training. Three churches in Nebraska send immediate cash for HDTI.

Internal: HDTI workday on facility demonstrates initiation and completion of task as they paint walls and doors of residence, finishing up with signs on the doors listing occupants and picture of Iron Man.

Contradiction: Finding the screen that holds comprehensive in midst of particular engagement. (WK. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell's community Health Caretaker from Stake 4,

registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Khatau takes four site visits in Vaviharsh, Athwad, Kendur and Mailwada to check on progress since its personnel attended the consults. Global Methods School reports 75 participants in training to be Mahatmas.

Internal: House sends out four from Area Bombay to courses and meetings in Area Calcutta.

Contradiction: Utilizing dispersion across the continent effectively. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Site visit of BASF to Athwad, and of Kahtau's company representatives to Kendur and Vaviharsh solidify future relationships with those companies, and the continuance of their support to those villages. All across the 25 district projects, keystone modules takes place to actuate programs.

Internal: American nationals assigned to the Sub-Continent successfully renew their visas for yet another three months.

Contradiction: Balancing the priority use of limited financial resources to create the district signs without stagnating talukas and strongholds. (Wk. 10)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Meeting with local bank manager sets stage for integrated loan financing for the whole village and begins frantic week of house to house loan survey. After Maliwada and Sikror site visits, Danida promises major support for Maharashtra Actuation.

Internal: Fine celebration with Chinese and Indian dishes and fireworks marks Diwali (goddess of wealth) and begins major agency Development push.

Contradiction: Creating solid maneuvers to complete the year's work by December for first year celebration in Sikror. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Villagers start building a 150 feet stone and cement drain with voluntary labor.

Internal: Auxiliary spends the morning cleaning the house and caps the day with dinner and movie at Sangareddy.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to make visits to government departments in spite of heavy farm work. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First CYFs are held on sub-continent with top Patna schools. Continental staff assembles to hold events and train Calcutta staff.

Internal: Stream of visitors to House brings refreshment and fresh news.

Contradiction: Creating a configuration of both troops and events that shifts the consciousness of the sub-continent to impact and places the House in project preparation position. (Wk. 10)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Immigration papers for Nexus staff are in the final stages.

Internal: House celebrates Hilary's birthday with meal at Indian restaurant.

Contradiction: Developing events for symbolizing the leap. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Transitioning spiritizing event gives Kuala Lumpur House a boost in the right direction. NorChoni's up-date on authorization framing for TM increases the excitement.

Internal: Judy Appenfelder talks with Mr. Loom about Kentucky Fried Chicken job creating comprehensive teaching plan for employees.

Contradiction: Consolidating the village structures into one coordinating entity to sustain the village through transition and beyond. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Signal futuric meeting happens in Kampung Dahung. Government officials representing several departments give permission and confidence that government, ICA and community will be working together. New secretariat is formed and given official approval by local government.

Internal: House travels to wedding of Hasan (KD auxiliary) and Leti (15 year old bride). Kite flying season begins and Dirk's birthday are celebrated with three layered Indonesian cake.

Contradiction: Holding tension between placing the Project responsibility on village secretariat and revving up actuation. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: HDTs is launched with 30 staff and 70 participants with six of seven Coastal Village Growth Centers represented. Group includes three government officials, five from transmigration project in Central Sumatra, and others are villagers. Whole Training School goes to five coastal villages to launch Bubun Cluster with first DOOP. First USD 12,500 in bank.

Internal: House celebrates Mohd Ibrahim's (from India) 27th birthday and welcomes Tom Holt, three month sojourner from St. Olaf College in Minnesota, as HDTs participant.

Contradiction: Doing practices and building curriculum while School is going on. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP

External: Meeting with the Provincial Government features outstanding (with fear and trembling) report on Year 1 by village headman and yields approval for Bontoa Expansion plan with Rp. 4.4 million. Mosque Committee leader visits steel factory and receives approval for G.I. sheets for mosque roofing. Nightly workdays produced 150 meters of road paved with rocks. Thirty-one religious class books from the Department of Religion in Maros arrive to start classes.

Internal: Workshop on East Indonesia Grid gives new consciousness of working and being on behalf of.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum at the village and at the same time starting new Pertemuan Masyarakat (Town Meeting). (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: The Nexus provided support forces for Development in Korea and Hong Kong and the final week of documentation in Hai Ou to create a brochure with the community telling their story. In the midst of a four day holiday the Philippine Peso audit preparation is done and the fine tuning for December maneuvering and timeline is planned by the whole Nexus.

Internal: The Nexus celebrates Thanksgiving with 32 Dim Sum orders and pumpkin pie.

Contradiction: Creating forms of care that empowers the local with new images of the centrums in their support role. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: House sends Frank Soderlind to Taiwan for two week Development trip. Meeting with Jockey Club establishes that a grant for \$71,000 for dental equipment can likely be redirected to construction of a permanent facility in the community center.

Internal: House celebrated Thanksgiving under the rubric of Harvest Festival.

Contradiction: Substantial in village maneuvers disclose need for reconstructing the public and private sector frame outside the village on behalf of the village and the ICA. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Fast paced week sees five tons of in-kind steel delivered and second floor steel work completed. In-kind for brochure printing is completed and brochure is delivered to printers. Two community meetings are held on content of brochure with fine village participation.

Internal: Storage space in neighbors house and crocodiles are finally cleaned.

Contradiction: Creating new strategies that take advantage of momentum created by Hai Ou brochure. (Wk10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: World Bank official visits Philippines and makes progress in negotiating Project with government officials stopping to brief ICA as he departs.

Internal: Anne Conroy and Dan Tuecke arrive for Development trek and cultural orientation.

Contradiction: Doubling size of HDTS facility during period of low income. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Appointments are set with six of the Top 500 industrial corporations based in Taiwan and never before visited by ICA. \$900 is received in hand for the week's Development work First "yes" for an in-house LENS in Taiwan in 1980 comes from Kaohsiung Monomer Company, Ltd., A subsidiary of the world-wide chemical corporation ICI.

Internal: John Slicker is sent out to New York City in conjunction with job upgrade and relocation with Associated Traders International Corporation.

Contradiction: Positioning key maneuver thrusts for victory in Quarters III and IV, 1980. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Barangay captains across Mactan gather in Training School to plan the 24 December Consults. Design to be used for the 24 signs and for T-shirts for 1,200 children and their ELNC teachers combines Iron Man and the First Lady's national nutrition slogan *Healthy Child, Healthy Nation*. Training School builds pedicab waiting shelter during workday and surprises barangay captains with the physical part of the curriculum. Cluster ELC teachers decide to close ELC's in December to join Cconsult team.

Internal: Blase Sands joins area prior in Davao to write AID proposal. House participates as guests of honor in Lapu Lapu fiesta.

Contradiction: Deciding to move into the guest room we've been saving for the Messiah. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: First batch of cacao pods arrive to produce 4,000 seedlings; 3,000 are sent to the Valancia HDP, and 1,000 to Carmen HDP for germination. Harvest of first ovaltine crop begins and five new plots are completed in demonstration farm. Financial statements are completed for all five general stores in all five Projects showing increased profits.

Internal: House celebrates birthday of Emerging Generation, Alan Estorgio.

Contradiction: Getting someone trained to keep the pump and generator going under increasing loads. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Third TM is held for Mitsui Shipbuilding Co. in company apartment buildings in Chiba prefecture. TM dates are set in Shizuoka and Yamanashi prefectures. Follow-up visit to Uenohara results in GWF date and commitment of 10 women to take a GSD trip to Sudtonggan.

Internal: Monthly advisors (Guardians) dinner at the House is attended by 10 key colleagues, four of whom are new. All have been or will be TM leaders at Seibu store, demonstrating that engagement builds commitment.

Contradiction: Keeping it all tied together so that there is just one movement doing one great task. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Declaration Mission is launched.

Internal: Three new English classes are secured.

Contradiction: Catalyzing public-sector frame. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House conducts refresher workshop training for elite Ewha Girls School faculty. Purchase of 10 dairy calves for demonstration farm is lined up to initiate Project herd. The service of 50 medical students is offered for health clinic module boost in villages surrounding Project.

Internal: All are deeply impressed by poise and calm of citizens in Seoul amidst sudden death of President Park.

Contradiction: Finding the ways and the means to allow self-support to enable rather than overwhelm the external task. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: House program walk results in a workday. Health Outpost is cleaned, Library is renovated and Kerosene Store is painted red. Miss Lee teaches in preschool while teacher is involved in wedding.

Internal: aJose Armas celebrates his birthday.

Contradiction: Enabling programs to operate full swing in spite of winter. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: TM packets are ready to mail to 297 Social Education Community Centers in Ehime prefecture. Toyonaga sets-up appointments in Shimane and arranges a translator from Shimonoseki.

Internal: House spends four days on beautiful sea coast at Jesuit retreat house in fishing village of Kiyo.

Contradiction: Focusing on Week 8 collegial gathering in the midst of completing other projects. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Circuits to Kyoto, Nara and Tokushima uncover two strongholds (Nara and Tokushima). TM coordinator in Nara prefecture opens doors at county and prefecture levels. TM Coordinator with Social Education Office in Tokushima prefecture volunteers to go circuiting in March.

Internal: House travels to Kyoto to visit shrines and to experience cultural life of Japan.

Contradiction: Holding the comprehensive in mind while doing the particular to maintain creativity and spirit. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Mr. Miya from Sangyo Business Institute in Tokyo plans to visit Oyubari in December to help with the economic research.

Internal: Oyugikai (singing, dancing and drama) cultural program is given by Naomi Sato's Kindergarten with parents' participation.

Contradiction: Struggling to find the economic possibility that will then enable corporate patterns to develop. (Wk. 10)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Meeting with youth group results in firm plans for six Community Youth Forums to be held with other forums in Ku-ring-gui shire early in the new year.

Internal: Spin by clergy colleague on *Ladder of Human Liberation* intrigues House with a journey of consciousness through secular language.

Contradiction: Breaking loose strategizing time for the keystone on immediacies. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: RS-1 calling continues with reflection on current strategy and broadening it. Workshops are held to build screens for State Advisory Board and broaden permeation strategy.

Internal: Perth House roster is complete with the arrival of Barbara and Marissa Hawley. House celebrates with "sherry" hour at the Sheraton.

Contradiction: Trusting the decision to go for broke on immediate strategy. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Visits to Lower Murray area bring affirmative response to a forum for staff working with aborigines and to a proposal for one sponsored by Jay-Cees.

Internal: Neil Rees returns after working as volunteer at Bontoa and Sungai Lui HDP's.

Contradiction: Planning for the future in the midst of programmatic fog. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Regional newsletter is printed and posted to first 150 on a soon-to-be computerized mailing list. Material is inked for Murrin Bridge sewing industry and delivered there by Mark Grundy as he visits for weekend. Guardian (from Arkansas), Richard Butler, and three friends from Broken Hill visit to see Murrin Bridge products and get acquainted.

Internal: House Church at Emerald Lake after trip through Dandenong on restored narrow gauge steam train is delightful bonus to attending Emerald planning meeting toward January CMA event there.

Contradiction: Creating practical stories and format for regional council which allows colleagues to catch fire. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Circuit team holds Community Meetings in aboriginal communities of Ginie and Dennenaw lead by Murrin Bridge residents. Question of the continuation of light industries forces community into seriously considering the future and self image.

Internal: Sydney House task forces ink bread and muscle for bracketed jobs.

Contradiction: Finding fresh imaginal ways to build the solid residue. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: House inked \$2,000 worth of negatives, ink, paper and printing for national report. Development sees Managing Director of Mt. Isa Mines and leaves three good proposals for \$10,000 working and sets up appointments for House for next week. House attends West End Ecumenical Meeting.

Internal: House sends out half Area Trek team and receives Development team from Suva.

Contradiction: Seeing the end of Quarter II as a golden opportunity for Development work to put House on a firm footing next year. (Wk. 10)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: TASC organizes its week to allow for three extensive ECF training sessions plus voluntarily working five of seven nights and all day on a local holiday, creating new strategies for "doing the impossible".

Internal: Ecclesiola structure offers needed discontinuity during most hectic week of the quarter.

Contradiction: Engaging our frame in the TASC future model. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Shadows and stake people are interested in beautification. They help work on seaside park, which has a great impact to the children.

Internal: House's Halloween celebration has exciting mysterious impact in the village as children play masked games and get a good scare at haunted fun house.

Contradiction: Finding the key to go beyond handout mentality of Development. (Wk. 9)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Town Meeting Steering Committees do set-up

maneuvers on their own while House backs them up with TV advertising and the possibility of a half hour interview to provide momentum for other towns to set-up TMs.

Internal: Delores Penrod, of Portales, New Mexico, stays at the house while attending a HUD conference and invites us to listen in on explanation of new community development grants.

Contradiction: Designing every play to make a touchdown in deciding what game to win each week. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: Fernando Campos arrives from Guatemala and his welcome is aided by four colleagues in Richgrove who speak to him in Spanish.

Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Assoc., meeting in Washington, D.C. endorses Help For Health program, providing clout to use with member companies. Band Meeting dates set for January 4-9 in Brussels. Hong Kong dollars flow and Chicago Centrum remaneuvering releases new approaches and energy to claim the 1.2 million victory. The key contradiction lies in the arena of harvesting working monies in order to provide space for comprehensive planning, training and long range strategy.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Quarter III Ecclesiola Manuals are in the mail to the International Houses by December 1. The Vision pilots enable depth refinement to get underway. Hong Kong Nexus reflects end evaluates Research activities for the past seven weeks and draws a consensus of direction for the next five weeks. Everyman a Researcher is beginning to emerge in Seapac as Nexus works seriously on the role of the continent in the 80's and the Islam world implications. The key contradiction lies in the arena of Centrum to local Houses interchange which continually discovers the channels and occasions for that exchange to be infrequent and unformed.

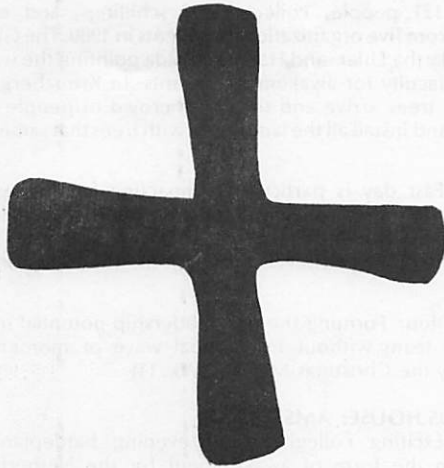
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: It's a great week of girding the frame as Dr Udekwa talks with the Nigerian Vice President and Catholic Secretariat getting full support for ICA work. Five women's groups are pitched for children's care. Eight Town Meetings are set up in Bendle state. Bishop Segun indicates support will come from yet another of the candidates for President Chief Awolowo. The Dutch ambassador visits Ijede.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of one thrust when in two locations. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Evening at the Institute is held at House with 17 colleagues and new acquaintances in attendance to hear report on Kenya with slides given by Johannes Bruckner and Harry Janssen. Colleagues help with enablement and tour House during show. Two registrations for Christmas trek follow within two days.

Internal: Hosting of 15 social workers from Cairo demonstrates preparedness.

Contradiction: Keeping materials and permission demands ahead of need. (Wk. 11)

NAIROBI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: NORAD come through in two days with grant from discretionary fund. Power of local man is demonstrated in Kabiro in various forms. Mzee Mwaura participates in Identity Systems panel of HDTI and gets great response from students. Housing committee in Kabiro selects housing plan to go with for the future. Kabiro committee plans and implements workday on community center. Health caretakers complete first aid training. Three churches in Nebraska send immediate cash for HDTI.

Internal: HDTI workday on facility demonstrates initiation and completion of task as they paint walls and doors of residence, finishing up with signs on the doors listing occupants and picture of Iron Man.

Contradiction: Finding the screen that holds comprehensive in midst of particular engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell's community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Villagers start building a 150 feet stone and cement drain with voluntary labor.

Internal: Auxiliary spends the morning cleaning the house and caps the day with dinner and movie at Sangareddy.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to make visits to government departments in spite of heavy farm work. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The first two Gram Sabhas are held in Bihar. (The Gram Sabha in Pakri village is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Patliputra, Patna and the Gram Sabha near Muzaffarpur sponsored by the Agricultural Development Branch of the State Bank of India.) The first Global Women's Forum for this year is held in Calcutta City.

Internal: Ramnath Hekde and Chagan Dhangare arrive from Maliwada to participate in the awakening campaign.

Contradiction: Setting sights on Quarter III as preparing for Project Selection while capturing the victory of this quarter's awakening campaign. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

Mosque Committee leader visits steel factory and receives approval for G.I. sheets for mosque roofing. Nightly workdays produced 150 meters of road paved with rocks. Thirty-one religious class books from the Department of Religion in Maros arrive to start classes.

Internal: Workshop on East Indonesia Grid gives new consciousness of working and being on behalf of.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum at the village and at the same time starting new Pertemuan Masyarakat (Town Meeting). (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Consult task force is sent to Sudtonggan for set-up. House is dispersed in mission across the zone with four Development treks in three nations and closing week of Sudtonggan HDTS.

Internal: Advent reflection and *Ice Age Man* study powerfully enable brooding on role and nature of the Religious in society.

Contradiction: Clarifying time design for study and reflection necessary for weeks of preceding SEAPAC Council. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: House sends Frank Soderlind to Taiwan for two week Development trip. Meeting with Jockey Club establishes that a grant for \$71,000 for dental equipment can likely be redirected to construction of a permanent facility in the community center.

Internal: John Slicker is sent out to New York City in conjunction with job upgrade and relocation with Associated Traders International Corporation.

Contradiction: Positioning key maneuver thrusts for victory in Quarters III and IV, 1980. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Cluster hosts 20 dignitaries in third of weekly luncheons using HDTS participants to tell story of the 24 and elicit support. Global film is screened for Jaycees who prepare to host 80 Cebu supporters at a showing Week 10. Rock contract is signed by Sudtonggan Rock Guild guarantees six months of large orders for 50 men in three of the cluster villages.

Internal: Week of cultural celebrations includes Lapu Lapu Fiesta festivities and American Thanksgiving reenactment by Emerging Generation.

Contradiction: Actuating an assignment rationale that cares for 24 villages. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: First batch of cacao pods arrive to produce 4,000 seedlings; 3,000 are sent to the Valancia HDP, and 1,000 to Carmen HDP for germination. Harvest of first ovaltine crop begins and five new plots are completed in demonstration farm. Financial statements are completed for all five general stores in all five Projects showing increased profits.

Internal: House celebrates birthday of Emerging Generation, Alan Estorgio.

Contradiction: Getting someone trained to keep the pump and generator going under increasing loads. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Discerning the ever-awesome future of Jeju-Do. (Wk. 11)

Internal: Cheers go up as the corporate store gets repaired in the midst of a sub-freezing period. Contradiction: Raising the question of where we are going in the midst of tearing ahead. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: TM packets are ready to mail to 297 Social Education Community Centers in Ehime prefecture. Toyonaga sets-up appointments in Shimane and arranges a translator from Shimono-Seki.

Internal: House spends four days on beautiful sea coast at Jesuit retreat house in fishing village of Kiyo.

Contradiction: Focusing on Week 8 collegial gathering in the midst of completing other projects. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Shiga/Gifu Circuit results in new contact at Monastery in Tagima. Development week set up results in four Advisors' Lunch Bunch luncheons set along with numerous other appointments.

Internal: Colleagues and friends donate turkey and other feast foods and spend full day at house preparing the feast in honor of American and Japanese Thanksgiving Holiday.

Contradiction: Generating the sparks that give people permission to move ahead and get the job done. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Community leaders meeting structures cooperative relationship with ICA. Youth group begins planning for Christmas party and sends out Miss Nakajima and Mr. Kobayashi to Sudtonggan. New guardian from Tokyo, Professor Miya, offers assistance for building community economic plan.

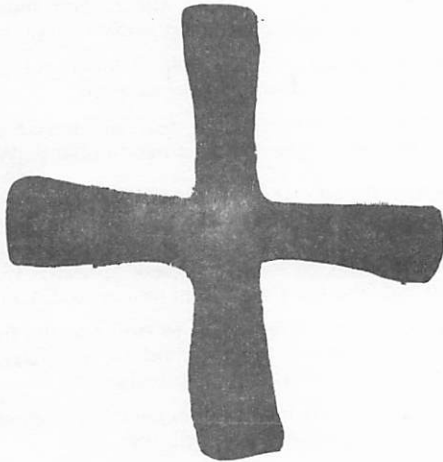
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Presence of Jack Gilles for LENS trek allows for mind expanding collegiums on Africa and LENS while first Cairo LENS seminar is set for March with ICL.

Contradiction: Enabling the newness to be claimed by the community as its own, in the midst of rapid changes in the village appearance and structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Following long silence, Mr. Derry of KenAfrica Foundation promises delivery of tractor and plow. Kabiro businessmen contributes band for Saturday night dance in Kabiro with 500 in attendance. Training session with Central Division officers of Machakos District is held in Kamweleni

and releases fine closing speech by D.O. who declares, "This is exactly what we need to do our job." Workday in Kabiro with residents and HDTI participants completes half km of trench for the water system.

Internal: Great celebration is held for House to send Mr. Dethé out to Kapini and El Bayad with cokes and fantastic Indian sweets.

Contradiction: Creating the radically new style and systems that anticipate expansion and frozenness. (Wk. 12)

External: Marcel's community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

Mosque Committee leader visits steel factory and receives approval for G.I. sheets for mosque roofing. Nightly workdays produced 150 meters of road paved with rocks. Thirty-one religious class books from the Department of Religion in Maros arrive to start classes.

Internal: Workshop on East Indonesia Grid gives new consciousness of working and being on behalf of.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum at the village and at the same time starting new Pertemuan Masyarakat (Town Meeting). (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Consult task force is sent to Sudtonggan for set-up. House is dispersed in mission across the zone with four Development treks in three nations and closing week of Sudtonggan HDTs.

Internal: Advent reflection and *Ice Age Man* study powerfully enable brooding on role and nature of the Religious in society.

Contradiction: Clarifying time design for study and reflection necessary for weeks of preceding SEAPAC Council. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Meeting with Jardine's, Nam Wa Foundation, Ltd., District Officer, and Secretary of New Territories indicates that Mau Tin Development is going ahead according to plan.

Internal: House attends wedding of Yau Kuen, Lin's son.

Contradiction: Creating a new set of maneuvers in response to rumors that pond is being sold. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: A special community meeting with the local leadership and foreman carpenter breaks loose the next phase of building, followed next day by completion of second floor pipe work. New self-support possibilities emerge as Guardian arranges English classes and invitations for a Guardians evening are sent off.

Internal: House appreciates a \$300 washing machine donated by a villager in Hai-Ou.

Contradiction: Rationalizing the time-consuming English classes which provide minimal remunerative return. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: World Bank official visits Philippines and makes progress in negotiating Project with government officials stopping to brief ICA as he departs.

Internal: Anne Conroy and Dan Tuecke arrive for Development trek and cultural orientation.

Contradiction: Doubling size of HDTs facility during period of low income. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Weeks 8-9 Development trek results in deposit of \$5,100, including the first donation from a major Japanese invested company in Taiwan (Sanyo). In-house LENS with Kaohsiung Monomer Company, Ltd. is confirmed for January 18-20, 1980--the first LENS in southern Taiwan (Kaohsiung Region). RCA is very strong for LENS in April while first large Chinese industrial corporation (Pacific Electric Wire & Cable Co., Ltd.) requests LENS for its top management personnel.

Internal: Tourist visas for Hai Ou staff are currently being extended while government processes move ahead on entry visas for all new staff in Taiwan.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between creation of the four-year global strategy and response to immediate programmatic opportunities within each nation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Cluster hosts 20 dignitaries in third of weekly luncheons using HDTs participants to tell story of the 24 and elicit support. Global film is screened for Jaycees who prepare to host 80 Cebu supporters at a showing Week 10. Rock contract is signed by Sudtonggan Rock Guild guarantees six months of large orders for 50 men in three of the cluster villages.

Internal: Week of cultural celebrations includes Lapu Lapu Fiesta festivities and American Thanksgiving reenactment by Emerging Generation

Contradiction: Actuating an assignment rationale that cares for 24 villages. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Forty-eight Development proposals are delivered in preparation for Development blitz. Two thousand cacao seedlings are germinated in both Magtuod HDP and La Paz HDP. Langub HDP water system extends to Demonstration Farm.

Internal: Collegiums on birth control system in China, El Bayad HDP, and Davao Regional Grid provide images for the future.

Contradiction: Getting school drop-outs committed to take a special acceleration test offered by the department of Education and Culture. (Wk. 12)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: One day LENS consult is held with the Research and Development Section of the Local Authorities Systems Development Center to plan the future of Research and Development activities. Seibu Store Town Meetings numbers 23 and 24 complete the first half of the project prior to six weeks intermission for Christmas and New Years.

Internal: Guardian Paul Murayama hosts the House at a fine restaurant and summons two company cars to return his guests to their home.

Contradiction: Learning how to work from within established social structures in a way that builds real momentum and catalyzes real change(Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Barley marketing Agriculture module is set up.

Internal: A week of collegium travels into next four years in Jeju clarifies the present week.

Contradiction: Transparentizing the *Stone Grandfather Myth* for Awakening use. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House conducts refresher workshop training for elite Ewha Girls School faculty. Purchase of 10 dairy calves for demonstration farm is lined up to initiate Project herd. The service of 50 medical students is offered for health clinic module boost in villages surrounding Project.

Internal: All are deeply impressed by poise and calm of citizens in Seoul amidst sudden death of President Park.

Contradiction: Finding the ways and the means to allow self-support to enable rather than overwhelm the external task. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Community has work week, to bring down feed from the mountain for common cattle barn, to winterize piggery, to gather the rice straw for bedding, and to fix the water pipes.

Contradiction: Focusing on Week 8 collegial gathering in the midst of completing other projects. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Double circuit to Gifu and Nara involves five volunteer circuiters. Development raises 28,000 yen. House is introduced to the American Chamber of Commerce and discovers many old friends and contacts.

Internal: Mally Balm returns from Sudtonggan HDTs with spiritizing stories.

Contradiction: Structuring the training center dynamic to capture everyone who walks in door. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Cultural program on India is presented to Oyubari Junior School. Industrial research continues with conversation with local piano veneer factory manager.

Internal: Reservations are made for trip to Korea for January Area Council.

Contradiction: Bringing enough economic possibility soon enough to release Oyubari residents to go through the Project to TMs outside Oyubari this year. (Wk. 12)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Saturation set up continues with visits to two CMA towns. House sets up two GWFs in North Sydney and Rurri Kurri. CYF pedagogy is held with nine around table. Global film and Murrin Bridge slides are shown to 12 including nine new contacts.

Internal: House hosts Development and Murrin Bridge teams.

Contradiction: Anchoring the saturation advantage concretely before summer/holiday typhoons hit. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: A fine RS-I is held with 15 around the table and local colleague Richard Pether doing the fourth teacher role. This keystone maneuver is capped by a miracle day in which the lounge is transformed with new curtains and a new bar, built by the area prior. The House launches into maneuver building for the next six months and preparing for an Open House.

Internal: The Oakleys end an area trek by hosting the House at a fine feast they prepare themselves..

Contradiction: Nailing down weekly maneuvers from the six month maneuver plan in order to inform daily action. (Wk. 12)

External: Regional Council of 14 grabs ahold of the challenges facing the Murrin Bridge economic development and Portland demonstraion community vision with maturity and commitment. Guardian brings his \$205 cheque for Murrin Bridge table and takes professional photos of the products to sell to his neighbors and friends.

Internal: Baker family is sent out to Advent discontinuity before Joanne's baby arrives.

Contradiction: Utilizing discontinuity to maximize missional effectiveness. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: House makes important friendly contact for authorization through visiting Aboriginal communities at Dareton and visits to Murrin Bridge. First shipment of zucchini goes by rail to Sydney market.

Internal: Sojourners from Italy, Marky Grundy and Sergio Messina, join staff and captivate community.

Contradiction: Rebinding the fractured structures that enable leadership to work together. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: National Report goes to printer. Evans family gives \$150 to House. Large monthly calendars are created for office.

Internal: Blitz on yard is followed by visit to local pool and multi-cultural festival at local park.

Contradiction: Moving quickly through next steps for concretizing maneuver strategies. (Wk. 12)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

Internal: House's Halloween celebration has exciting mysterious impact in the village as children play masked games and get a good scare at haunted fun house.

Contradiction: Finding the key to go beyond handout mentality of Development. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: California communities on the Move: Tulare County Communities Conference is held in Pixley with 50 participants from seven towns deciding to work together across the county. In-House case study LENS provides pedagogy and impetus to marketing week for 12 House and Metro troops.

Internal: Judy and Rich land temporary jobs, Joan qualifies for unemployment and colleagues invite us to a house painting to put us in the black on self-support for Christmas.

Contradiction: Getting clear on vision beyond the end of the quarter in order to relate now to the rest of the year. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: Fernando Campos arrives from Guatemala and his welcome is aided by four colleagues in Richgrove who speak to him in Spanish.

Contradiction: Building more adequate structures to maintain a broad base of community engagement and support. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: LENS course with Arizona State Department of Economic Security awakens Department and Division managers to the power of consensus methods. Advantage of collegial relationship with state and district administrators enlivens prospects for TM and Demonstration Community followup.

Internal: Ecclesiola is signal event with presence of Mary Warren Moffet and local guardians forging regional timeline and assignments for metro actualization of continental Guardian tactical system.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum of local guardians' engagement while House troops are on the road to New Mexico Regional Council. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: House meeting on FMHA rehab money and pre-application meeting with Southwest Border Commission opens new funding sources with greater readiness by Community. Jess Sixkiller, State ACTION Director, and Jan Wadlington, ACTION Congressional liaison in Washington, D.C. take a site visit.

Internal: Christmas schedule is planned with party, caroling and decor.

Contradiction: Arranging for more goodwill from Tribes BIA to complete winter planting. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Week II Regional Council in Great Falls hosted by Conrad and Gayle Himmel results in solid decision to do the region thru metro councils. Research PSU on "Whats Happened Since TM?" is greatly enabled by in-kind use of a Guardian's State WATS line. In spite of 63 degree weather, enough Christmas spirit is garnered to mail out the invitation to the House Christmas party and Open House.

Internal: Self-support blitz with three people working eight various part-time jobs releases entire month's money in one week.

Contradiction: Weaving myriad events into one tapestry in the midst of the ambiguity of undetermined schedules of new self-support jobs. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cannonball expansion takes off again as Kenel TM excites local residents who discuss which two from their district should attend the HDTs. Industry leaps forward as it receives \$5800 order from one buyer.

Internal: House steps out for evening on the town before ending with 2 a.m. breakfast before the long ride home.

Contradiction: Breaking through the limited strategic plans for expansion which restrict Project movement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Targeted San Juan Town Meetings are confirmed for Week 4 and flyers in five languages are distributed. The region enables colleague, Armands Divas, from target community to participate in HDTs. Region participates in Pisinemo first year celebration by sending painting of earthrise and numerous telegrams of congratulations.

Internal: House sends first three installments of \$100 per month to Pisinemo for self-support.

Contradiction: Coordinating and directing many events to insure the greatest impact. (Wk. 5)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Community Forum Breton and five other events see

75 people participate in CFC dynamic which is good news for the Alberta 75 Campaign.

Internal: Ecclesiola is moved to Saturday night to catch more than one at home.

Contradiction: Focusing the invitation at the point where people have their passion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Two great Community Forums are held in Huntingdon and Jubilee on the same night as two coffee break demonstration forums involving six colleagues and 57 CFC participants and netting \$236.

Internal: Ecclesiola held with only the four House members strikes a balance with the heavy colleague participation of the last one and a half months.

Contradiction: Continuing to have great victories even through the Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

Internal: Martha's first full week of permeation yield salary and \$50 in tips.

Contradiction: Achieving critical victories in midst of radical dispersion. (Wk. 10)

External: Fine Development presentatin before Credit Union Central Board of Directors nets letter of endorsement to 200 Credit Unions of province. House gets out continental Christmas mailing.

Internal: Thirty-two feast on 37 pounds of turkey, 11 pies and more for Thanksgiving dinner.

Contradiction: Naming the victory that history needs from the Houston Region before January 1 in the face of unclarity about how to breakloose a forum schedule while society's mindset turns more and more toward Christmas and the holidays. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Regional gathering on Saturday is held at the Indianoma Christmas and decors community center with Mayor taking all on community tour. Community celebrates the 50th anniversary of the former mayor and Lydia Stoll.

Internal: House and regional colleagues drive to the wildlife refuge near Wichita mountains to cut down and bring home Red Cider Christmas Trees.

Contradiction: Discerning which way to be most catalytic at a time of emerging leadership. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Town Meeting in Meadowood Acres, the first demonstration community, is a great event with 70 present and bi-lingual leadership by Asherton residents and the first proposed event scheduled before Christmas.

Internal: Phase I control unexpected flood when the water pipe breaks while all adults are out of town.

Contradiction: Walking the tightrope of creating broadened community frame. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Town Meeting held in Fayetteville, Arkansas is set up by colleague David Beal, who is now attending HDTS in Chicago.

Internal: Luigi Persichetti attends HDTS for Economic Cycle and Jill Rodda joins HDTS for final three weeks.

Contradiction: Using the holiday season as an advantage in eliciting bureaucratic and colleague engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Shidler, Oklahoma, celebrates with their third Town Meeting. In a workshop reflecting on why Shidler has had several key accomplishments and an increased sense of pride while many towns have faded, the community deepens its commitment to pull off Shidler on behalf of the others. Seven proposals are submitted to Dallas companies totalling \$30,000.

Internal: Ecclesiola is celebrated with colleagues and lots of cake from the Regional Cakewalk Development push.

Contradiction: Bringing focus to what we say we're going to do so we can DO it. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Cluster assembly plans are firmed up as eight towns respond and sign up to participate. Office of Energy strategy is built for the 80's and work begins with transition teams from new Governor elect, William Winter's, office.

Internal: House has a week of celebrations as colleague comes to dinner and Christmas tree and decor go up.

Contradiction: Creating necessary models and momentum that will kick House into 1980 in the midst of time demands and limits of Council, Christmas discontinuity, and courting new government administration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Ten local workshop leaders emerge from three training events to lead and back-up great 90 person CYF in black community. Event is covered by newspaper and TV network. New leaders are eager to join road team in leading CYFs elsewhere.

Internal: Colleague families move into the house on alternate nights releasing all adults to state maneuvers.

Contradiction: Appropriating within selves to the point of practical actuation that to win in the State Campaign demands winning in Development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Evening at the Institute in holiday season renews relationship with old and acquaints new colleague.

Internal: Celebration of Advent brings refreshing new hope to the grind of proposal rewriting after Week II is spent preparing the new draft for TM saturation in Arkansas.

Contradiction: Waiting for the State to inform House of the next move. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Seventy-five sophomores from Fulton H.S. Gifted Minorities program in Knoxville attend CYF which is broadcast on TV news program that evening. Key city-wide Atlanta GWF includes Dorothy Cotton (Region IV Action Director). Candler-Glenwood leadership training ends with evaluation and plans for weekly guild meetings for winter and spring quarters.

Internal: Ann Loy arrives from Knoxville to participate in Atlanta GWF.

Contradiction: Getting nod from key local frame for second phase of urban strategy. (Wk. 12)

Four Town Meetings are held, a total of 50 events will be completed as a result of the quarter's work.

Internal: The beginning of Advent is marked at the house with the wreath and at the church by participation in two significant acts of worship which use the calendar and forms out of Local Church Experiment.

Contradiction: Naming the victory of the quarter in such a way that motivates preparation of maneuvers which exploit present advantages into a future breakthrough. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: House begins planning for continental council with corporate brooding. Management receives payback on TASC loan which enables sending out full program checks for past two months. Blue Skies Maneuver report excites all.

Internal: Abundant Thanksgiving celebration is held with Academy joining House and guests.

Contradiction: Enforcing corporate discipline and a new decision to produce. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Victory is won on the Community Center with the fulfillment of the contract. Bathrooms are retiled, stalls are in place, powder rooms have appropriate lighting, walls are painted, Voice room is remodeled with darkroom, Washington Hall is remodeled, ramp for elders is in place and adds sophistication and frame for glass front entrance demonstrating visible sign for all those passing.

Internal: House celebrates traditional Thanksgiving and decides the Mayflower Compact is appropriate.

Contradiction: Needing and searching for an option that allows untrained local men to rehearse comprehensive decision making while avoiding the temptation to dump and run under the guise of temptation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA—LORIMOR HDP

External: Workday with 19 present closes in Community Center for the Winter. Applications are now being taken for housing rehab under \$323,000 Community Development Block Grant (\$160,000 towards housing). Halloween is appropriately celebrated with trick-or-treats and 100 kids through a Haunted House.

Internal: House celebrates Heidi Zahrt's birthday as she turns 16.

Contradiction: The gold rush has begun and we're still looking for the map. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Bruce Lanphear attends CYF in Indianapolis, visits to KCMO and KCK city governments open possibilities for CYFs and LENS in city. Regional Council in Lorimor makes concrete plans for HDTs in Lorimor and the Iowa Campaign.

Internal: Dallas Ziegenhorn attends dental seminar, Russell Wheellock goes to vocational education meeting in California and Donna Ziegenhorn opens a new House Box Service in Oklahoma with hot-air balloon ride.

Contradiction: Securing 1980 funding from willing corporations that are now making budget decisions while still not having a thought-through financial story for the Lorimor HDTs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Northlands Campaign mid-course review illuminates the effectivity of LENS as the planning tool for campaigns as we see that key strategies were right on and working. Marshall County has agreed to be the first pilot with a County LENS and 10 Town Meetings. House sends out Joe and Delores Killian, retired couple, for six months in Azpitia.

Internal: Fantastic celebration at end of day is held after Metro colleagues joined House staff in warming the house with attic insulation and covering fireplaces with glass doors.

House receives gift of shares of common stock from well established St. Louis family. New Cambria, Missouri receives State Community Betterment Award following T.M. proposal implementation.

Internal: Karl Miller gets a job after seven years of unemployment.

Contradiction: Using corporate time to squeeze seven days into three before Continental Council. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Local Development Corporation holds election of officers and adopts bylaws.

Internal: Advent begins with visit from Santa to House and Mini Park.

Contradiction: Delivering methods training while honoring existing structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

Internal: Informal Community Corporation Board Meeting happens around Mike's bed. Local man calls to ask for help in starting a garage/gas station.

Internal: Barbara's sister, Kinney youth, and invalid Mike join House at the Thanksgiving table, with 16 Kinney folks arriving later for dessert.

Contradiction: Doing the project and running the House, without neglecting either. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

Internal: Blue Skies team objectifies missional realities and possibilities.

Contradiction: Expanding the operational consensus for the next six months. (Wk. 12)

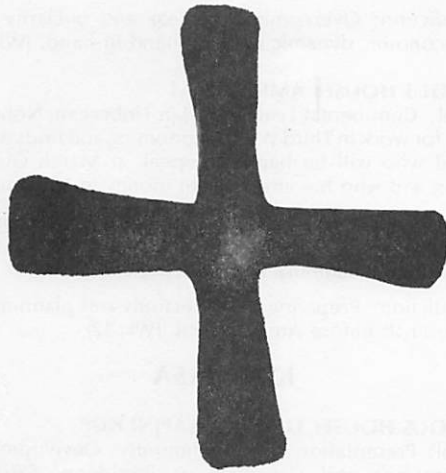
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: Elusive actuation breakthrough finally comes as village leadership organizes bullock carts to dump 60 loads of dirt into new road while new murals and signs appear around village. Development team focuses on actuation as Australian High Commission, Population Services, and a pump manufacturer donate visits to assist with preschool, clinic, and hand pump for Brisani well.

Internal: Realization of actuation death ground in village breaks loose creativity of staff and villagers alike.

Contradiction: Finding effective means to use village and private sector momentum to release government promises into action. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAIRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Village start building a 150 foot stone and cement drain with voluntary labor.

Internal: Auxiliary spends the morning clearing the house and caps the day with dinner and movie at Singareddy.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to make visits to government departments in spite of heavy farm work. (Wk. 11)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Who could ask for more? Grand finale of the awakening campaign happens with two training events, eight Gram Sabhas, and one Community Youth Forum involving 1500 souls in the three states of Behai, Orissa, and West Bengal.

Internal: Development team, Danaraj Darlington and Vaughn O'Halloran, arrives.

Contradiction: Creating the powerful image that releases the next phases of project launching. (Wk. 13)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Troops create Bubun HDTs staff model for transition into actuation of the North Sumatra village demonstration clusters. Guardians event is set for January 18.

Internal: Stellar collegiums are held on news from Australia, Kenya, Bangkok, and Europe via visit to Brussels.

Contradiction: Getting in gear for Quarter III now when experience is of racing to keep abreast of current swirl. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Sungai Lui transition is in full swing with announcement of departure date to village leadership core, four sessions on Sungai Lui HDP documentation with Nexus, and meetings with board members opening up new possibilities for future. Visit to large Japanese Corporation opens new doors into Japanese Community.

Internal: Visit with the Chief of Community Development of the Ministry of Agriculture brings many new possibilities relative to self-support and Impact in Malaysia.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on the readiness of the village to transit. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Key leader of Ministry of Home Affairs helps ICA to strengthen national and provincial frames. Nurada kicks off construction of community center by 50 person gotong royong workday. Land deal is negotiated by villagers and government.

Internal: A. Paul's baby girl arrives three weeks early, just 12 hours after Antony arrives on the scene from Bubun.

Contradiction: Realizing government decision in December to enable extension in September, 1980, while at the same time intensifying the demonstration so that every local government office will beg for extension. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Fourth DOOP, the Human Development Module, with focus on living environment brings out master plan design for Bubun. Ur image impact is great with releasing celebration Saturday night with food, singing, and dancing

from the six urs. Provincial head of rural development speaks to HDTs participants about Governor's seven prognoses for village development and challenges Bubun to le prest of way from undeveloped to developed village.

Internal: Kaz study in HDTs gives images to the "cry" struggle to articulate in familiar Islamic terms.

Contradiction: Creating the mythology to sustain the movement which is forming before our eyes. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP

External: Fourteen more Pertemuan Masyarakat (GCF) are held in the Maros sub-district as the campaign powers through its second week with five teams doing one or two meetings a day. Forty Bontoa women enliven the community center as home care courses begin despite the rainy season and rice field work commencing. Construction begins on long awaited elementary school.

Internal: Collegium on the SEAPAC grid pushes depth reflection on the differences between political crisis and underlying relations across Asia.

Contradiction: Adjusting village structures to embrace the new season of rain and rice fields, GCF scheduling and new village courses all at once. (Wk. 13)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Consult task force is sent to Sudtonggan for set-up. House is dispersed in mission across the zone with four Development treks in three nations and closing week of Sudtonggan HDTs

Internal: Advent reflection and *Ice Age Man* study powerfully enable brooding on role and nature of the Religious in society.

Contradiction: Clarifying time design for study and reflection necessary for weeks of preceding SEAPAC Council. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Nam Wai Foundation, Ltd. Board meet to arrange for funding for new community center. It will be begun before the new year. Funding includes \$71,600 from Jockey Club, \$10,000 from District Office, with the remaining \$118,400 being loaned by three Board members.

Internal: House attends seventh village-wide feast this quarter.

Contradiction: Imagining the platform on which to stand to create the next level of engagement in Region Hong Kong. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: A special community meeting with the local leadership and foreign carpenter breaks loose the next phase of building, followed next day by completion of second floor pipe work. New self-support possibilities emerge as Guardian arranges English classes and invitations for Guardians evening are sent out.

Internal: House appreciates a \$300 washing machine donated by a villager in Hai-Ou.

Contradiction: Rationalizing the time-consuming English classes which provide minimal remunerative return. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: It is a week of in-kind victories with Toyota Jeepney for Mactan delivered to boat and with Rancie cloth for teachers' uniforms for 20 new Mactan preschools. There are also breakthroughs with companies including two inquiries about doing projects cooperatively around company plantations, endorsement by Japanese Chamber of Commerce, and LENS seminar set for January with San Miguel Corporation.

Internal: House is visited by two Oyubari residents returning from Sudtonggan trip.

Contradiction: Focusing all programs into one national thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Weeks 8-9 Development trek results in deposit of \$5,100, including the first donation from a major Japanese invested company in Taiwan (Sanyo). In-house LENS with Kaohsiung Monomer Company, Ltd. is confirmed for January 18-20, 1980--the first LENS in southern Taiwan (Kaohsiung Region). RCA is very strong for LENS in April while first large Chinese industrial corporation (Pacific Electric Wire & Cable Co., Ltd.) requests LENS for its top management personnel.

Internal: Tourist visas for Hai Ou staff are currently being extended while government processes move ahead on entry visas for all new staff in Taiwan.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between creation of the four-year global strategy and response to immediate programmatic opportunities within each nation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Final preparation for 24 Mactan Island Consults is completed as two government vehicles are loaned for three weeks use, stenciling of 1200 T-shirts is begun, and Lapu Lapu Nutrition Committee meets for last briefing before consults. At same time, HDTs works with City Engineer's office during workday to widen Sudtonggan road, celebrates at Mayor's resthouse and hosts great closing feast and graduation with many guests. HDTs and Cluster shift into consult teams for Island Council.

Internal: House receives two members of Hong Kong Nexus as troops for Mactan Island consults.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum from HDTs to the intensive timing of 24 two day consults in three weeks. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Eight thousand more cacao seeds are delivered to Luman HDP, Carmen HDP, LaPaz HDP, and Magtuod HDP. Irrigation proposal for Luman HDP is approved for funding by regional government. Farm Systems Development Corporation, the Davao City Mayor, and Regional Director of MLDCG endorse proposal to expand Langub HDP water system and send it to Manila.

Internal: New water tank is installed inside the kitchen and staff training collegiums on JWM talks, SEAPAC grid, and global news continue to undergird the House.

Contradiction: Designing an operational system to continue the acceleration of programs while dealing with very limited funds. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Prefecture government sponsors the first TM in Shizuoka with 60 present as the launching event for a semi-official "community movement". Northwest Orient Airlines is prepared to become a TM regional sponsor by contributing 1,000,000 yen in Asian travel.

Internal: Week II 24 hour LENS and TM pedagogy session is held at the House with nine colleagues participating, mostly businessmen advisors.

Contradiction: Designing a shift in the sojourner program so that it supports the mission more directly (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Experimental series of declaration missions is completed with twelfth in Sang Yang Ri.

Internal: Passage film impacts House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythm while dancing so close to the edge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Meeting with 30 medical students gives form to an exciting health maneuver in Kuh Du E Ri and surrounding villages.

Internal: Lazear family arrival creates new death ground in housing issue as six adults and four children squeeze into a four room house.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on mission and program that provides an adequate response to the new mood in Korea. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Community has work week, to bring down feed from the mountain for common cattle barn, to winterize piggery, to gather the rice straw for bedding, and to fix the water pipes.

Internal: Temporary wall creates house space out of community hall giving the staff a toasty warm meeting area.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly to keep up with the immediate needs, without having eyes on a long-range goal. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Four Town Meetings in Okinawa catalyzes stronghold. Nagasaki stronghold goes well with 18 events scheduled in March, 1980. Development strengthens with three new key contacts.

Internal: House celebrates Mark McClelland's 17th birthday with great spaghetti feast and fun games.

Contradiction: Focusing on Week 8 collegial gathering in the midst of completing other projects. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Double circuit to Gifu and Nara involves five volunteer circuiters. Development raises 28,000 yen. House is introduced to the American Chamber of Commerce and discovers many old friends and contacts.

Internal: Mally Balm returns from Sudtonggan HDTs with spiritizing stories.

Contradiction: Structuring the training center dynamic to capture everyone who walks in door. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Oyubari residents continue negotiations for YMCA camp move to Oyubari. Community Cooperative Ski Association in Yuni is visited. Many meetings are held in preparation for community Christmas parties.

Internal: Mr. Kobayashi and Miss Nakajima return from Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Deciding how to move now on TMs from a geographical / remote base. (Wk. 13)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Saturation set up continues with visits to two CMA towns. House sets up two GWFs in North Sydney and Rurri Kurri. CYF pedagogy is held with nine around table. Global film and Murrin Bridge slides are shown to 12 including nine new contacts.

Internal: House hosts Development and Murrin Bridge teams.

Contradiction: Anchoring the saturation advantage concretely before summer/holiday typhoons hit. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Exciting Open House event is held Wednesday night with 15 guests including RS-I grads, long-time colleagues, and new friends. Six month maneuvers are prepared, printed, and placed on a timeline. Key Development appointments are set for next weeks Development thrust.

Internal: The last piece of decor is hung in the lounge just in time for the Open House.

Contradiction: Discerning and stating the one thing we are out to do in the midst of all the tactics and maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Development team raises \$540 and secures many new openings for the coming year.

Internal: Bruce and Helen Martin host garden Christmas party for House and colleagues.

Contradiction: Moving on advantages in the midst of internal transition. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Regional Council of 14 grabs ahold of the challenges facing the Murrin Bridge economic development and Portland demonstration community vision with maturity and commitment. Guardian brings his \$205 cheque for Murrin Bridge table and takes professional photos of the products to sell to his neighbors and friends.

Internal: Baker family is sent out to Advent discontinuity before Joanne's baby arrives.

Contradiction: Utilizing discontinuity to maximize missional effectiveness. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Dorothy and Lance Joluson return with Ken Otto from Melbourne after extensive marketing trip leaving deep impact and opening future discussions for industry directions. Helpful Coonchie meeting is held with Ossie Cruz, Aboriginal Lands Trust present. One day with no water stirs community action.

Internal: Fridge from Sydney and washing machine from Melbourne, both donated, boost morale.

Contradiction: Finding a process that allows the committees to make decisions. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Three new orchestrators are trained as two CYFs are held at Brisbane State Highschool. TAA airlines say "yes" to shipping the National Report free of charge to all the Houses. Development focuses on year end donor contributions and company proposals totaling \$6000 submitted to MIM and Gow Industries.

Internal: Several "irons in the fire" raises hopes for new free facility.

Contradiction: Maintaining our stride as House approaches quarter's finishing line so as to ensure participating in the winner's circle. (Wk. 13)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Severe tidal wave destroys much of Majuro (D-U-D area) including the Majuro House and President Carter declares Majuro a US federal disaster area. ICA and TASC staff become the supply liaison and hold three orientation sessions for the 30 American Red Cross volunteers and staff flown in. Sales at TASC continue to the few customers still in business and increase to Red Cross and US Army who set up three tent cities and feed 10,000 daily.

Internal: Baileys return for Regional Council glad to have a room instead of a tent, and ongoing House structures offer an island of normalcy in a sea of chaos.

Contradiction: Transforming the disaster wave into a creative wave that allows the refinancing of TASC. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Shadows and stake people are interested in beautification. They help work on seaside park, which has a great impact to the children.

Internal: House's Halloween celebration has exciting mysterious impact in the village as children play masked games and get a good scare at haunted fun house.

Contradiction: Finding the key to go beyond handout mentality of Development. (Wk. 9)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: US Fish and Wildlife service is the highlight of the week with a Special Issues Forum set up in virgin territory, a \$6000 check for October expenses and LENS program, and a great workshop which convinces the staff to trust the method. Ernie Leonard from US F & W goes to Continental Council along with regional colleagues, Roberta Beebe and David St. John.

Internal: The week begins with Mark Rebstock's 12th birthday and ends with a self-support house cleaning and painting maneuver employing half the house in Sacramento while the roaches get bombed in the kitchen.

Contradiction: Getting ready for the 80's when our head is still in the 70's. (Wk. 13)

Contradiction: Continuing nuts and bolts of in-kind, files, Community Service Center construction, and ongoing programs in midst of Christmas celebrations, Continental Council updating, and quarter planning. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: House centers last newsletter of the year on global events from the GOR bringing surprise and delight to those preparing it for mailing.

Internal: Youth cluster and friends celebrate the end of 1979 with in-kind pizza and 16 free tickets to first run showing of *Star Trek*.

Contradiction: Gearing up for another week of Development and no messiahs in sight. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Church network in San Bernardino metro is opened with two film showings. Tulare Demonstration Community Cluster is launched with day long strategies planning meeting attended by 50 people from six communities. House participates in week LENS training in San Francisco.

Internal: Fantastic Week II economic, political and cultural odyssey in Mexico includes total House and regional colleagues in three carfuls.

Contradiction: Turning exploding openings into concrete advantages for a year long strategy. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: LENS follow-up calls and calls to towns of Arizona relative to documentation bring forth towns already to move and possibility of six more LENSEs in Arizona.

Internal: Trimming trees, Ecclesiola, and House Church are attended weightily by guardians including Travis Thompson from Albuquerque.

Contradiction: Creating the story that gives cohesion to the vision and focus to strategy so that we choose right choices on behalf of the globe. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: House meeting on FMHA rehab money and pre-application meeting with Southwest Border Commission opens new funding sources with greater readiness by Community. Jess Sixkiller, State ACTION Director, and Jan Wadlington, ACTION Congressional liaison in Washington, D.C. take a site visit.

Internal: Christmas schedule is planned with party, caroling and decor.

Contradiction: Arranging for more goodwill from Tribes BIA to complete winter planting. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Community Forum is held on Rocky Boy (Chippawa-Cree) reservation with 53 in attendance for an all day meeting in the gymnasium. High school class attends and sets date for CYF in January.

Internal: Fantastic House Church welcomes back Philbrooks from Continental Council and celebrates Rob and Catherine Bartlett's first anniversary.

Contradiction: Allowing the discontinuity of this season to be creative in its impact when it seems everything has been discontinuous all quarter in the midst of complex self-support and circuit schedules. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cannonball expansion takes off again as Kenel TM excites local residents who discuss which two from their district should attend the HDTS. Industry leaps forward as it receives \$5800 order from one buyer.

Internal: House steps out for evening on the town before ending with 2 a.m. breakfast before the long ride home.

Contradiction: Breaking through the limited strategic plans for expansion which restrict Project movement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Development victory nets \$10,600 in hand with more committed by end of year. Rocky Mountain High Maneuver (revisiting all of Colorado's towns who held TMs) continues with excellent responses and several requests for future workshops.

Internal: Ecclesiola creates regional symbol for the 80's and plans New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Finishing the wrapping of regional Christmas gifts in time to place under tree for victory celebration. (Wk. 13)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Community Forum Breton and five other events see 75 people participate in CFC dynamic which is good news for the Alberta 75 Campaign.

Internal: Ecclesiola is moved to Saturday night to catch more than one at home.

Contradiction: Focusing the invitation at the point where people have their passion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Two great Community Forums are held in Huntingdon and Jubilee on the same night as two coffee break demonstration forums involving six colleagues and 57 CFC participants and netting \$236.

Internal: Ecclesiola held with only the four House members strikes a balance with the heavy colleague participation of the last one and a half months.

Contradiction: Continuing to have great victories even through the Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Two women pick up crafts coop responsibility while Eartha is at HDTS.

Internal: Martha's first full week of permeation yield salary and \$50 in tips.

Contradiction: Achieving critical victories in midst of radical dispersion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Saskatoon House participates in signal Continental Council which is the most intensive, most destinal, and the most local-man-participating-in experienced in a long while.

Internal: In preparation for Council, House zooms through the vision, contradictions, and proposals for the region for the next four years in three short sessions.

Contradiction: Meshing wisdom and expenditure with colleagues across the region, area and continent so that the world is assured of victory. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: The sawmill business loan is approved by the CEDF Board which will mean four more jobs in Vogar. Development team in Winnipeg returns with \$3,500 in hand.

Internal: Gay Kennedy is sent to the HDTS.

Contradiction: Discerning a strategy that will call forth and formulate Vogar community leadership quickly. (Wk. 9)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Twenty-nine folks from four of the six regions of Area Houston participate in the Voyage. Computer prints 825 Regional newsletter labels. Teams explore six urban demonstration community prospects selected by Chamber of Commerce. Trull Foundation says "yes" to \$5K for Town Meeting.

Internal: Thirty-two feast on 37 pounds of turkey, 11 pies and more for Thanksgiving dinner.

Contradiction: Naming the victory that history needs from the Houston Region before January 1 in the face of unclarity about how to break loose a forum schedule while society's mindset turns more and more toward Christmas and the holidays. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Mayor and ICDC president attend Continental

Council in Chicago. New welcome sign is cut and painting begins. Grocery store package to FHA is submitted after local citizen makes \$3000 available. Fifty apply for energy assistance at the community center. Christmas edition of Voice is mailed. VISTA volunteers hold Christmas party. ICDC holds two and a half hour meeting making many decisions with 20 items on the agenda.

Internal: House sends families out for Christmas discontinuity.

Contradiction: Maintaining motivity and momentum during Christmas /New Year discontinuous time. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Town Meeting in Meadowood Acres, the first demonstration community, is a great event with 70 present and bi-lingual leadership by Asherton residents and the first proposed event scheduled before Christmas.

Internal: Phase I control unexpected flood when the water pipe breaks while all adults are out of town.

Contradiction: Walking the tightrope of creating broadened community frame. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Town Meeting held in Fayetteville, Arkansas is set up by colleague David Beal, who is now attending HDTS in Chicago.

Internal: Luigi Persichetti attends HDTS for Economic Cycle and Jill Rodda joins HDTS for final three weeks.

Contradiction: Using the holiday season as an advantage in eliciting bureaucratic and colleague engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Shidler, Oklahoma, celebrates with their third Town Meeting. In a workshop reflecting on why Shidler has had several key accomplishments and an increased sense of pride while many towns have faded, the community deepens its commitment to pull off Shidler on behalf of the others. Seven proposals are submitted to Dallas companies totalling \$30,000.

Internal: Ecclesiola is celebrated with colleagues and lots of cake from the Regional Cakewalk Development push.

Contradiction: Bringing focus to what we say we're going to do so we can DO it. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Cluster assembly plans are firmed up as eight towns respond and sign up to participate. Office of Energy strategy is built for the 80's and work begins with transition teams from new Governor elect, William Winter's, office.

Internal: House has a week of celebrations as colleague comes to dinner and Christmas tree and decor go up.

Contradiction: Creating necessary models and momentum that will kick House into 1980 in the midst of time demands and limits of Council, Christmas discontinuity, and courting new government administration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Evening at the Institute in holiday season renews relationship with old and acquaints new colleague.

Internal: Celebration of Advent brings refreshing new hope to the grind of proposal rewriting after Week II is spent preparing the new draft for TM saturation in Arkansas.

Contradiction: Waiting for the State to inform House of the next move. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Seventy-five sophomores from Fulton H.S. Gifted Minorities program in Knoxville attend CYF which is broadcast on TV news program that evening. Key city-wide Atlanta GWF includes Dorothy Cotton (Region IV Action Director). Candler-Glenwood leadership training ends with evaluation and plans for weekly guild meetings for winter and spring quarters.

Internal: Ann Loy arrives from Knoxville to participate in Atlanta GWF.

Contradiction: Getting nod from key local frame for second phase of urban strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community moves in all Guild arenas as Town Council says "yes" to HUD Rural Initiations program, visit to E.L.C. Certification Office. Twelve youth at Guild meeting and one house member assists Miami House in Tallahassee Metro Donor Circuits and raises \$5018 which is two and a half times the bottom line.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with everyone cooking one dish creates corporate celebration in midst of having five of 12 House members on the road.

Contradiction: Assuming, rather than thorough planning leaves House with no immediately viable site for ELC relocation and one week behind schedule. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: A demonstration Town Meeting with 70 developmentally disabled persons in Dade County surprises professionals who work with them over their ability to work corporately through the three and a half hour meeting. Four Town Meetings are held, a total of 50 events will be completed as a result of the quarter's work.

Internal: The beginning of Advent is marked at the house with the wreath and at the church by participation in two significant acts of worship which use the calendar and forms out of Local Church Experiment.

Contradiction: Naming the victory of the quarter in such a way that motivates preparation of maneuvers which exploit present advantage into a future breakthrough. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: House begins planning for continental council with corporate brooding. Management receives payback on TASC loan which enables sending out full program checks for past two months. Blue Skies Maneuver report excites all.

Internal: Abundant Thanksgiving celebration is held with Academy joining House and guests.

Contradiction: Enforcing corporate discipline and a new decision to produce. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

Internal: House celebrates traditional Thanksgiving and decides the Mayflower Compact is appropriate.

Contradiction: Needing and searching for an option that allows untrained local men to rehearse comprehensive decision making while avoiding the temptation to dump and run under the guise of temptation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA—LORIMOR HDP

External: Workday with 19 present closes in Community Center for the Winter. Applications are now being taken for housing rehab under \$323,000 Community Development Block Grant (\$160,000 towards housing). Halloween is appropriately celebrated with trick-or-treats and 100 kids through a Haunted House.

Internal: House celebrates Heidi Zahrt's birthday as she turns 16.

Contradiction: The gold rush has begun and we're still looking for the map. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Bruce Lanphear attends CYF in Indianapolis, visits to KCMO and KCK city governments open possibilities for CYFs and LENS in city. Regional Council in Lorimor makes concrete plans for HDTS in Lorimor and the Iowa Campaign.

Internal: Dallas Ziegenhorn attends dental seminar, Russell Wheellock goes to vocational education meeting in California and Donna Ziegenhorn opens a new House Box Service in Oklahoma with hot-air balloon ride.

Contradiction: Securing 1980 funding from willing corporations that are now making budget decisions while still not having a thought-through financial story for the Lorimor HDTS. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Northlands Campaign mid-course review illuminates the effectivity of LENS as the planning tool for campaigns as we see that key strategies were right on and working. Marshall County has agreed to be the first pilot with a County LENS and 10 Town Meetings. House sends out Joe and Delores Killian, retired couple, for six months in Azpitia.

Internal: Fantastic celebration at end of day is held after Metro colleagues joined House staff in warming the house with attic insulation and covering fireplaces with glass doors.

Contradiction: Finding ways to work through networks in building major campaign. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Christmas mailing is sent out to all regional colleagues and Town Meeting grads. Mark Harvey is sent out to Continental Council. East St. Louis CYF is set.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with gift exchange and festive meal with accordian accompaniment by Karl Miller.

Contradiction: Preparing to charge into the new year knowing that we must leap over the impending Christmas holiday. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Local Development Corporation holds election of officers and adopts bylaws.

Internal: Advent begins with visit from Santa to House and Mini Park.

Contradiction: Delivering methods training while honoring existing structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

Internal: Informal Community Corporation Board Meeting happens around Mike's bed. Local man calls to ask for help in starting a garage/gas station.

Internal: Barbara's sister, Kinney youth, and invalid Mike join House at the Thanksgiving table, with 16 Kinney folks arriving later for dessert.

Contradiction: Doing the project and running the House, without neglecting either. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The House uses the Continental Council in Chicago as the occasion to meet one day early with representatives of the Minneapolis, Detroit, and Kinney Houses to prepare the maneuvers for the combined thrust to catalyze the Northlands Campaign.

Internal: The youth efficiently and effectively manage the house, including the cooking and set-up for House Church while all the adults attend Council.

Contradiction: Converting all the learnings and decisions from the Council into practical events on a realistic timeline. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Joni Fleischman and two others are first youth elected to the Board of Mapleton-Fall Creek Neighborhood Association and Neighborhood Youth Council meets at House to go Christmas carolling and have a celebration.

Internal: Entire House attends Continental Council and begins a round of cadre Christmas celebrations from Lafayette to Louisville.

Contradiction: Moving into the 80's with power on all fronts. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

Internal: Four from the House and four from the Metro attend Continental Council resulting in vision clarification and new resolve for six month strategies.

Contradiction: Focusing dissipated House energy. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Night at the Institute draws new audience and demonstrates how local man in USA is impacted by local man's efforts across the world. Global film showing catalyzes second showing in church.

Internal: There's new liveliness in House as Everald returns from Academy with glowing reports and immediately recruits one for the spring academy.

Contradiction: "Finishing the framing" so House can move into impact event setup. (Wk. 12)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The Urban Summit hosted by Loisida, with three

urban communities represented reflects on implications of the urban probes of this quarter. Evening at the Institute, hosted by Vice-president of a major transnational corporation, draws 25.

Internal: Collegium conversations on Iran and framing within the historical church create mood of reflection on our relationship to the world religions at this point in history.

Contradiction: Hosting committed colleagues gracefully at Christmas and New Year celebrations while getting the bottom line of \$1000. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

Internal: House presence is transformed with paint and decor for hosting the community board for dinner.

Contradiction: Racing Sleigh '79 to the finish line of the decade so that preparations are secured for a winning winter quarter. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Participation in New England Guardians Meeting in Boston, Urban Summit in New York, and CYF presentation to Methodist Church in Augusta, Maine scatters House in many directions.

Internal: Old and new colleagues come by to see how they can participate, and work on proposals and advocacy.

Contradiction: Building screens to inform us how effectively to hold the tension among many demands and possibilities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

Internal: Mike Holm visits to look over the books.

Contradiction: Creating structures to do detailed long term planning. (Wk. 12)
