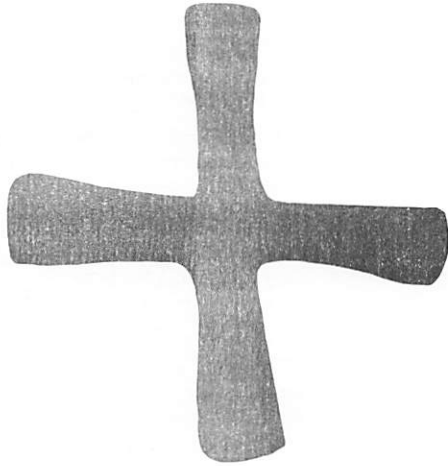

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Demonstration LENS is held with 20 in attendance, representing several major businesses including two from Scotland. New TM workbooks and brochure are printed in area blitz. Religious orders give \$800 in-hand in one week.

Internal: Petra Wazlawek arrives from Germany for work in Project, and Margaret Morgan visits on way to India, reporting on great Academy experience.

Contradiction: Determining which openings are blind alleys and which are key breakthroughs to victory this quarter. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Week starts with a session at colleague's home, contexting on coming quarter's maneuvers, followed by a three-day trek to Grampian Region including a demonstration TM for 12 community workers, set-up for two TMs and bringing home a check for £250 (US\$500).

Internal: Monday morning collegiums from JWM papers are regular spirit shot in the arm.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time and energy to keep all the programs moving together. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Management Board builds their capital funding timeline and community women build their model for sewing industry, while 50 Guardians receive their Christmas cards and last quarter's TMs breakdown impact event possibilities.

Internal: One hundred twenty-eight pound salary check comes in as House returns from exciting Area Council in Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Forming community consensus about use of community space. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Four *Forum Communautaire* are held in four different polises.

Internal: First ecclesiola event of the quarter has guests Stan and Patti Mathews.

Contradiction: Doing the whole area—actually and practically. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The abandoned building provided by the municipality for the factory gets a beautiful sign erected, rubble cleared, and some windows installed. Security blinds and roof tiles are on order. The first GCF circuit for the quarter goes to Venice, phones in with one meeting set, all housing and food inkinded so far. The Sisters of Charity approve large grants for India and Termine industry. Three new Italian PR pieces are designed and run off. Guardian mailing goes out to 27.

Internal: Tom Greyshock and two sojourners, one German and one Canadian, swell troops in Termine for reconstruction of industry building.

Contradiction: Changing the "hibernation in January" story in the village to full speed ahead. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Enugu Circuit returns with reports of three TMs held in Igbo Ukwu, all with proposals to start fish farms and small industry. Mr. Sanni returns as a man of iron, an experienced TM orchestrator, and a miracle story in himself. Hot on the circuit's heels, Mr. Unedike, of Nigerfarms Ltd., rolls in for a site visit, and invites ICA to send him two staff immediately to start an HDP in

eastern village. The week of incredible visits is capped when the President of the "Progressive Society", an Ijeda-based Lagos organization, drops by during Sunday House planning meeting to request assistance in arranging a bulldozer for the clearing of land for the new primary school, and ends up volunteering three people to come on the in-kind calls.

Internal: Visits to the Project by Paul Schrijnen (on his way to the CYF trek), Sisters Bernadette and Monica of the Holy Child Sisters, and six Anglican diocese officials, including the Bishop Akintembe and Archdeacon Ajayi, symbolize the presence of the ecumenical religious.

Contradiction: Moving in the fog of legality in building the sewing factory without running into a tree. (Wk. 3)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus receives notification of two grants from Rome order and Milan Foundation. GCF continental symbol, a bulls eye, is distributed to all Houses.

Internal: First round of India staff are in and out for visa renewal.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering to meet all January bottom-lines for all centrums. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Thirteen TMs set up in one week, along with biggest Development circuit in Belgium, with the Movement engaging fully in both, signal a fantastic week.

Internal: Preparing materials for Wallonia, translation sessions and guests for ecclesiola point to a week of Movement swirl.

Contradiction: Ensuring quality in the avalanche of Town Meetings. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Area Council produces geography-oriented maneuvers, creating new corporateness in going for broke on TM in the Benelux. CYF trek of Paul Schrijnen to Nigeria produces over \$500 in developed travel monies.

Internal: House moves out of present facility and into colleagues' homes as first step in self-support maneuver.

Contradiction: Deciding the symbol of victory that will sustain House on the road in finding a new facility quickly. (Wk. 4)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Region sends out Birgit Lauser to Kawangware, Petra Wazlawek to Isle of Dogs and Michael Ziegler to Tai'rgwaith for three-month sojourns. Elizabeth does one evening of phone pitches to raise DM800 and Geri brings home the new circuit car the next evening.

Internal: TM team spends weekend planning and celebrates with hamburgers and movie at the US Air Force cafeteria.

Contradiction: Assuring TM circuiter's victory decision conquers minor obstacles of first week: no car, a cranky car, sore throats and the most snow seen in Germany in 20 years. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: After community quarter planning, new community task force assignments are made, a great neighborhood TM is held with 15 from one apartment building, and the first methods training session with 12 around table concludes week with Saturday night celebration. Two students from Darmstadt join the Project for three-month practicum. Workshop on housing model nets new legal Guardian.

Internal: Area prior's visit and new internal structures catalyze new sense of missional corporateness.

Contradiction: Creating a practical vision of relationship between Project and ICA. (Wk. 5)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: "Rise-Up Africa" is the spirit of the Bi-Continental Council attended by all Area Kinshasa staff in Nairobi. Kapini village leadership assume total responsibility for running the Project as 15 auxiliary leave for the Tamzam train ride to the council. On return, Area Council draws in long-time grads to Kapini for work on the three campaigns.

Internal: Meg Wildhack reaches Kapini, finally, a welcome return since her work as educator during the Kapini Consult.

Contradiction: Re-creating comprehensive Project picture in midst of community move to become engulfed in particular programs that are high-security, low-risk. (Wk. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The water tank, beautifully painted with the grid and phrase, "Water is the life of Bayad," is raised to the top of the water tower by a crane contributed for the day.

Internal: House celebrates Western and Eastern Christmas with staggered discontinuities to visit Egypt and two great Christmas feasts.

Contradiction: Building on the excitement of the water system victory to intensify Bayad leadership. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Project receives K.Shs 4,000 "no-strings" grant from government along with request to submit proposal for continuing support. ATT offers to send hand pump from Tanzania for Kamweleni. Twenty Kawangware/Kamweleni teachers recover their roles as imaginal educators with week of intensive training and end with workday to prepare for opening of schools. University student sets up trickle irrigation experiment on DUF. First guild meeting of quarter creates maneuver timeline. Industrial procurement intensifies. Week of GCF training goes on prior to first saturation blitz of the new quarter.

Internal: Birgit Lauser arrives from Germany as volunteer for 10 weeks.

Contradiction: Producing victories that release motivity to win. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Workday marks first progress in dam-building in Kamweleni in 23 years, and draws 39 participants with representation from each stake and from the nearby village of Mulindi. The building of 43 washstops in one day lays groundwork in soil conservation which must be initiated before the government will authorize the building of a dam. Nairobi Development call shows that a successful community developer does not have to speak English or be literate. Community leadership increases as stake leaders visit every stake with auxiliary and most stakes assume responsibility to install their own call bells for stake meetings.

Internal: Augustine Hajega returns from week of siteselection and Village Meetings in the coast province.

Contradiction: Enabling auxiliary to demonstrate the corporate style necessary to catalyze Iron Men in Kamweleni. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with

150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDS and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Newly assigned strike force teams meet to plan four-week campaign in the six spotlight villages. Teams sent out and meet back on weekend to finalize timeline, bringing enthusiastic villagers with them to help in planning.

Internal: Nexus received the first contingent of Management Centrum into Bombay to prepare for audit.

Contradiction: Equipping the troops on the field to do effective and catalytic action, not just for one village but for the 232. (Wk. 5)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghaziabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is re-vamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House pulls together crucial data for global team on approaches to obtaining Nexus appropriate legal form.

Internal: House hosts Spencer-Wainwright team plus John Cock and James Chia, and Australian friend Naomi Spencer.

Contradiction: Designing the kind of internal life that authentically cares for people in the midst of dealing with the unexpected intrusions of the Mystery. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Global strike force from Chicago and Area Singapore arrives to help prepare for Chief Minister's visit, February 7th. Guardian net begins to emerge in Kota Kinohalu as private sector and government officials all work to ensure a great visit by Chief Minister. The village is transformed with whole village working together. Documents arrive right before Chief Minister's visit. Road is leveled to Serusup, new ferry landing is built and a workday at beach prepares for picnic which follows visit to village. Chief Minister has great visit, promises his support and sets up meeting for ICA to meet with him relative to needs of Project.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates New Year's Eve at Minister of Social Welfare's party and attends holiday parties during discontinuity at key private and government official homes.

Contradiction: Getting village leadership intimately involved in subtasks and assuming the responsibility for success of Project. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Both Mara Committee of 16 and Stake Meeting are led by villagers with real professionalism. Stake 4 decides to again hold English classes, but to insure it continuance, assigns three youth to teach and auxiliary to aid them in writing curriculum. Twenty-one farmers meet and organize scheduling for two rented kabotas. Appointment with the Deputy Minister of Education holds unexpected surprise with presence of the Directors of Education for both the Sabah and Sarawak.

Internal: Program phasing workshop gives clear picture of where Project is and what thrust is next.

Contradiction: Moving all stakes along toward self-reliance. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Bubun USAID proposal is approved and Bontoa proposal submitted. House begins five weeks maneuver planning. Third lot of chickens begin laying eggs.

Internal: House sends James Chia out to do Development trek in Singapore.

Contradiction: Motivating secretariat to be a key leadership and a decision-making body. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Visitors come from Ministry of Internal Affairs and SEKAB (Cabinet) in Jakarta before final signing of agreement with Indonesian government. Ten provincial officials spend night in Bubun at Governor's request to see what has happened since the Consult. The week of preparation includes flowers planted, new doctor in residence at clinic, and two women leading weekly maneuver meeting. Villagers get new life from hearing their own reports and answering hard questions as to their plans for the future of the Project

Internal: Early Sunday celebrative meal is capped off with the return of Friday night's chicken dinner which had flown away and ice cold cokes all around.

Contradiction: Creating a timeline to include all necessary activities, yet overcome the tiredness and frustration from so many possibilities and demands. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: In the continuation of the gathering of baseline data, the economic survey is begun, and will be conquered! *The Voice of Bontoa* is started with villagers accepting assignments for articles, and the first article finished. A one-year plan for agriculture in Bontoa is completed to enable

assistance of the Department of Agriculture in Ujung Pandang. Five uniforms for preschool teachers are complete, with two of the young women doing the purchasing and the sewing of the skirts. Despite the day of continual rain, the floor of the kitchen is cemented to truly embark on its being a Community Demonstration Kitchen. (Wk. 5)

Internal: The staff takes out on Friday for a two-day retreat to look at where staff has been, maneuvers for the next six months, and to celebrate being generals.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between gearing up internally and holding village participation and activity. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: First issue of *SEAPAC Soundings*, a continental campaign news magazine, is mailed to the zone, continent, and the centrums.

Internal: Collegiums on Profound Humanness and profound functions of Development signal and catalyze further brooding.

Contradiction: Discerning the next creative leap so that depth meaning is uncovered in all that needs to be done. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Elders Forum is held. Hong Kong International School participates on New Year's workday, painting signs, bathrooms, etc. Dental clinic materials are costed. Attendance at Amcham anniversary keeps up contact with business Guardians.

Internal: Sushila Joshi visits and teaches in Elders Forum.

Contradiction: Tying up economic aspects of Project before Chinese New Year deadline. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4-H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Meeting with national YMCA staff sets stage for second wave of GCFs covering the Philippines. Multi-national supporters are blitzed with personalized gifts of Sudtonggan abbaca craft and Sudtonggan HDP photograph.

Internal: Week of Christmas celebration meals with parish people is capped by New Year's House meeting and celebration at Manila Peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating a metamorphoses in sustaining models to make "the leap." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: ICA Taiwan's financial ledgers and books are submitted to audit company covering entire operation of ICA in Taipei and Hai Ou HDP. New Year's mailing announcing the next Philippine HDTs are sent out to 200 colleagues, friends and supporters of ICA's task in Taiwan. As of December 31, Quarter II Development income for Taipei and Kaohsiung is US\$8,850.

Internal: Quarter III planning session reveals six maneuver arenas: Development, authorization, management, troops,

Taiwan circuits, and Hai Ou HDP situation.

Contradiction: Creating adequate corporate self-story and images to launch Taiwan circuits in twelve metros for the "Taiwan Gold" campaign. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Dr. Lao's traveling circus roars through Mactan with the completion of the second cluster Consult in the Shell/beach community of Malingin, as fish are pulled out of dry riverbeds and tents appear out of knapsacks. Busload of participants from San Miguel, the cluster village of last week's Consult, deepens the experience of all. In the meantime, Suba Panas and Basak Mercado have giant workdays (and also send delegates to Malingin) on their road, site preparation, etc. Site selection team from Department of Education and Culture inspects Sudtonggan for location of the first public preschool building, perhaps, in the Philippines. San Miguel Corporation executives commit themselves to support of one of four villages and do two site visits to pick one. They are discouraged because so much work has been done in two weeks that they can't get any decent "before" pictures.

Internal: Decision to move auxiliary facility to more central location in Sudtonggan is confirmed by staff house razing by fire, enabling the move of the auxiliary to the training school, which happens in two tricycle trips including all remaining personal goods.

Contradiction: Pushing models to bottom immediately instead of waiting for summer . . . the Philippines has already 'completed' its year. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Sewing industry gets wholesale material from Manila and begins mass production of kimonos. Biggest department store in Davao shows interest and orders samples of clothing items. Section II of training center is completed and work begins on Section III which will be the sewing industry section. Preschool takes field trip to Coke plant.

Internal: House completes move into training center just as old house begins to fall down. Potot children arrive from Sudtonggan, bringing total Emerging Generation to 16.

Contradiction: Creating the long-range community plans. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Global Women's Forum is held with university girls, most of whom have had RS-I and been to Oyubari. Seven of them trek to the new House at the close of the Forum.

Internal: House moves to new 19-room Japanese-style house.

Contradiction: Starting the field maneuvers on Week 4 with power and secured victory. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: First CYF with Presbyterian Youth Assembly, Jeju Island, is held with 40 present and a great event! Three villagers meet with auxiliary in workshop to lay out plan for preschool registration. Private grain mill owners and village leaders journey to county office to deal with issues in securing a common grain mill.

Internal: Ten university sojourners (7 men, 3 women) participate enthusiastically in a sojourn/intern training plan including common Order structures, Daily Office, ecclesiola, House Church plus global language and *kimchee* making.

Contradiction: Mobilizing through near-sighted immediacies. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-

meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: A trip to the city of Togo in prefecture is a surprise as House finds they are already using the TM methods. House continues to lay the groundwork in prefecture for Town Meetings. Prior makes a trip to Okinawa to investigate new leads for HDP. Capucian Fathers grant 50,000 yen, and a proposal is in the works for Coca-Cola to help fund the TM workbooks for the upcoming February maneuver..

Contradiction: Communicating the urgency of present maneuvers to task force colleagues. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Walking into a rural prefectural office without a translator yields a big office stir—five men coming forward to speak in English, and much very valuable information in the form of maps, statistics, charts. Over 150,000 yen in Development monies, five guests present for ecclesiola (four from different companies of the same Company group), and two LENS luncheons help to round out the week.

Internal: A two-week English intensive is accomplished through nightly "dining out", and nets 100,000 yen permeation monies.

Contradiction: Rehearsing the timing of the dance. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Metro circuits go in two directions to Erimo and Takikawa, visiting Guardians, recruiting LENS, and exploring opportunities for new Community Youth Forums. One more Town Meeting is set up with the confirmation of dates. Stake visitation in Oyubari reveals new opportunities for community activities.

Internal: The House sends out the Shaw family to new assignment in Tokyo.

Contradiction: Expanding the community's image of local development. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygandt family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Waitering and waitressing at Christmas dinner for family of Perth millionaire nets \$100 tip for sustenance coffers.

Internal: House sends Karen and John to Community Training Consultation in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Hanging ten while the external situation pushes House to hang fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: CTC strike force of Barry Oakley and Terry Weygandt arrive to collect \$100 from state committee member and \$500 from Nabisco as the first of their annual gifts for 1979 and 1980. Transrational models for state campaigns are taking new forms.

Internal: Finance forms are brought up to date and ready for audit.

Contradiction: Forging regional models that will release Area Council consensus without pre-empting that consensus. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Two months intensive authorization push ends with winning call to Sir John Crawford, top World Bank Advisor for funding for India, advisor to CIDA, and advisor to Australian Prime Minister. Sir John promises to visit Maliwada early in February. On the same day, Federal Department of Health invites House back, after having said no salaries for Murrin Bridge HDP, to talk again, and this time helps to write proposals for direct grant to ICA.

Internal: House receives Sisters Betty McGee and Janet Hughes to talk over getting authorization from their order to work in Latin America for two years, beginning late 1979.

Internal: House is transformed prior to Federal ministers' visits on December 19th.

Contradiction: Confronting the community with their self-story of the future in the midst of engagement. (Wk. 5)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: New maneuvers at TASC include massive marketing and advertising campaign, research, new hours on Saturday and baking lessons to teach the big bakeries how to use a different kind of flour. Secretariat commences Monday with a coordination lunch/collegium for showplace leaders.

Internal: First remaneuvering on Saturday night clears the decks for missional discontinuity following House Church Sunday morning.

Contradiction: Forming local stake leadership out of many people who are only willing to give a little bit of time. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

Internal: Robertson's daughter, Mariko (born 11/26/78) develops \$5 in church.

Contradiction: Reempowering transrational methods to deal with overwhelming complexity and to enable engagement. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: A county-wide organization of agencies and service groups votes to sponsor an area-wide Special Issue Forum on grassroots involvement—a major win for the San Bernardino stronghold.

Internal: Collegiums on framing, Movement formation and India set House spinning on new orbits with helpful input from Development team.

Contradiction: Building the frame to give a new picture of possibilities in Los Angeles. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

Internal: House sends the Filipski family to Richgrove HDP.

Contradiction: Reorganizing maneuvers around smaller House staff. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Community health office opens. First movie night transforms cafeteria into theater, with Youth selling popcorn.

Internal: First ecclesiola of the quarter provides opportunity for a variety of concerns to focus on global trends in fresh perspective.

Contradiction: Designing agriculture tactics that launch new thrust. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pickup truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House and metro colleagues meet with West Central Texas Council of Governments staff to plan a cluster of TMs and other forums north of Abilene in order to train COG staff. House member goes to Boulder, Colorado to teach RS-1.

Internal: House initiates quarter's "Ecclesiola Covenant Group" for colleagues in the metroplex.

Contradiction: Creating death ground in the Dallas Polis maneuver. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Imaginal Education is held with 24 in attendance, representing nine different preschools in the area. ECF is set with local merchant association. Solid openings are gained into citywide Girls Club, South Dekalb school system and local banks.

Internal: House spends week polishing House with the training center image.

Contradiction: Clarifying image of regular metro circuits in order to do tactics on post saturation nurture. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community prepares application for HUD block grant for housing and public facilities which strengthens authorization with town council.

Internal: On the day of the state's severe ice storm, ecclesiola provides oasis of spirit care with special attention to re-creation of space.

Contradiction: Writing quarter's maneuvers to reveal keystone. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: New colleagues in Eustis enable Lake County saturation by inviting their civic-minded friends to an evening with ICA and TM, and several volunteer to get things moving. Orange County CYFs continue to be set with three more in the bag and two pending.

Internal: House celebrates arrival of a "car for a month" the same afternoon a house is found to rent.

Contradiction: Maintaining the long-range vision that has quality and depth while doing the details. (Wk. 5)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Representatives are sent to the Development band meeting in Brussels, Academy recruitment teams hit the road, and a LENS trek goes to the West Coast. The global film is shown in Minneapolis to over 200 people. The January *Campaign News* is published and sent to Houses. The Student House holds a Week II of RS-I pedagogy.

Internal: The Nexus celebrates the birth of Mary Ellen Ruth to Mike and Jody May, and welcomes new interns: Leslie Halford and Jo Goodhead.

Contradiction: Moving with Quarter III maneuvers when whole new universes bubble up daily. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Environmental Maintenance Company is finally approved for city funding of \$100,000 and HDTS begins in Fifth City with 40+ participants. Commercial corporation task force completes first full week and celebrates grocery store's biggest day ever—\$7400 gross sales.

Internal: Major snowstorm adds fluff to birthday celebrations of Lela Mosley (50) and Tad and Todd Mueller (12).

Contradiction: Experiencing weather conditions as victimizing House into starting quarter without context, i.e. no quarter calendar. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Friday night Festival of Lights launches Christmas season with great success. Lights on 110-foot water tower, Snow King and Queen (senior citizens), a Christmas mall (flea market), and a procession down Main Street are highlights of the evening. Over 300 people participate even though it takes place during an ice storm. The *Des Moines Register* picks Lorimor for a December 24 special story on small town community Christmas celebrations. They will be in town several more times during the month. Three TMs are held near Lorimor, and \$3,000 is received from Hy Vee Foods.

Internal: Geoff Nixon has most successful Development week of the quarter (\$11,000 in hand) and picks up surplus desks for the Development office.

Contradiction: Using Christmas momentum to solidly launch next quarter. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Metro colleagues gather Saturday for stronghold maneuver workshop and plan for the community concerns lab to follow each stronghold. Four colleagues spend full time doing stronghold back-up.

Internal: Snowstorm allows intensification of stronghold back-up systems.

Contradiction: Handling on-going crucial practices while focusing on initiating the next stronghold. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development week consumes all in the House with raising monies as the Minneapolis Region Christmas gift to the world. Two thousand dollars is raised over and above the miraculous million bottom line of \$6,000.

Internal: "Santa's Elves" gather with caps on in the evenings to reflect on the day's victories and celebrate with wine and song each night of the Development week.

Contradiction: Defining and placing ourselves on the death ground that will insure victories for the Kinney HDP and regional saturation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Higbee schedules ECF. Inkind logistics, motel and food, are set up in advance for next week.

Internal: Panchayat trek is welcomed with collegial celebration and visit to St. Louis' promise to the future: the Arch.

Contradiction: Working with local groups and local people to do stronghold in coal country. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Panchayat visit sparks an event which demonstrates a new low-key style for community celebration.

Internal: House is impacted by presence of Bob and Fanny Dunlap throughout the week.

Contradiction: Strengthening corporate decision through eventful visioning and planning. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Winter Frolic meeting attendance jumps to 14, as caps and buttons are ordered, activities planned, timeline consensus reached, and everyone is involved.

Internal: Whole House journeys to Minneapolis for all or part of the week in great "\$5440 or Fight" blitz to erase Kinney

deficit with antiques, labor pool jobs, bazaar, dinner and even blood!

Contradiction: Turning the Winter Frolic into a key push on visibility, stakes, guilds, etc. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Alderman and senior citizens seek out House and provide key to saturation. Snow requires endless program shifts and provides opportunity to celebrate life as it is.

Internal: Strange angels provide a short-term, well-paid job in Chicago and a stimulating visit by Marilie Blanchard.

Contradiction: Remaining open to new possibilities relative to saturation while new data constantly sharpens focus and shifts previous plans. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Federated Church in Lafayette, which sent 33 to work at Inyan Wakagapi last June, asks where they are needed this year. New Guardian who attended Evening with the Panchayat comes to Daily Office and collegium two days later. Cadre dynamic begins to appear in Bloomington as five colleagues meet to plan February slide show.

Internal: Entire House sits down Saturday night to see global slide show and reflect on how to use it at TM assembly.

Contradiction: Ensuring attendance at Mentone assembly. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Metro circuits yield 14 new people exposed to slide show in Lexington. Saturation maneuver is planned for Columbus. Stronghold maintenance training events are set for Hamilton.

Internal: Quarter III launching celebration concludes with team and task assignment commissioning.

Contradiction: Sharpening and empowering new task team models for Quarter III. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Panchayat and House host two events—a guild meeting where regional framing is begun, and a meeting for clergy and lay who participated in Detroit saturation to discuss the role of the Church in the urban community.

Internal: Sixteen colleagues get involved as House readies and moves into free 16-room facility in one explosive week in time to receive Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Expanding the Guardian/patron base. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Ten metro colleagues plan for Quarter III Metro Council with House, and decide that the morning reporting session will write and publish a newsletter with features on Quarter II accomplishments.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 50 attending is highlighted by TM and GSD game, including three moves ahead for proper framing and two moves back for funding proposal failure.

Contradiction: Getting the three-year stronghold timeline, which is in everyone's mind, onto the wall. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Smithtown, Long Island's stronghold is launched with a 60-person TM out of which a core is established.

Internal: Three-year visioning of the urban lab, Loisaída, provides new insights into advantages in the urban.

Contradiction: Establishing systems that ensure regional and stronghold coordination. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Preparation for new quarter is climaxed by workshops with David Dunn from area Development.

Internal: Brian May and Linda Brock bring fresh vitality to House as they begin new assignment here.

Contradiction: Laying the groundwork in the midst of building the superstructure. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Representatives of both Houses in region plus area and nexus Development forces and regional ground force meet in Albany to plan Week 6 regional Development blitz and the implementaries necessary to launch it.

Internal: House sends representatives to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, for Economic Community Forum leadership training event and Youth to New York for CYF training.

Contradiction: Planning the events which ground the necessity of the mission in which House and all colleagues are engaged. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Response to spirit readings at corporate community meetings reflects great hunger for feeding the spirit. CS-I poetry turns around Economic Commission meeting, and Women's Guild looks forward to sharing readings from *Colored Girls*.

Internal: Sense prevails that the community and House are digging in as more leaders are sent out for training, circuits and global service.

Contradiction: Releasing the interchange of roles to allow all tasks to be done with revolutionary style. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Windows in gym get repaired and new gym hours are rescheduled at community meeting. Last of pallet contract is completed and delivered while community people search out new possibilities for another contract. Old contract brings in \$1,000 to people of Widen, mainly youth and retired people who do not have work elsewhere.

Internal: House gets new car and Justin gets off to New York after having met West Virginia and rolling with the punches.

Contradiction: Planning for move to new House while doing region and Project full speed simultaneously. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: A series of framing visits, a CYF training event, documentable, well-known group arising from a local neighborhood TM, and a strong local colleague in South Philadelphia all converge to create the maneuver plan with kick-off event for two strongholds in South Philadelphia.

Internal: The "Hong Kong" file is in place with a grassroots pledge system, systematic phone system, and a framing file keyed to it, moving House ahead in leaps and bounds.

Contradiction: Raising up local generals to handle the local stronghold maneuvers. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Demonstration Economic Community Forum is held in economically depressed community of Dover, New Jersey, with representation from industry, banks, retail and utilities. They decide that the next steps are for those present to implement proposals of an earlier TM.

Internal: Collegium on black ur rehearses common memory and reveals the vital dynamic in the emergence of humanity from Africa and the embodiment of this reality in the black ur.

Contradiction: Ensuring regional and stronghold coordination. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Second quarterly congress is held with 17 present despite snow storm. Meeting is led by community person. A highlight of the evening is a raffle in which a stay in Florida is given away.

Internal: Most unusual celebration yet, "the great push forward," recovers auxiliary member's car.

Contradiction: Catalyzing town leadership for the town's HDP. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: The Development planning workshop provides an avenue for wider involvement by colleagues and creates new enthusiasm. An updated mailing list is completed and typed onto address labels. Every day of next week has an appointment for GCF scheduled.

Internal: Ecclesiola college and seminary allow for a serious exchange of opinions, and sodality is fun.

Contradiction: Maintaining organization and discipline to make sure that interest and enthusiasm result in programs and money. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Local residents take charge of week as Project meeting is planned and workshops are led by core. Firewood industry steps forward with revised timeline and pro forma. Schenectady TV station comes out to interview staff and Project participants. Guardians do TM set-up calls in Glens Falls and discover support from former TMs held.

Internal: George and Sally Emerick travel to New York City to meet with Guardians and Chicago authorization team about ICA public relations issues, support for economic projects and self-support.

Contradiction: Trusting that even in the midst of ominous uncertainty, action removes the doubt that theory cannot solve. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two communities from Quarter II stronghold intend to hold larger Community Forums in their towns. One date is already set.

Internal: House holds a great stay-at-home celebration with pizza and ice cream.

Contradiction: Finding a practical way to cover the Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, stronghold with troops. (Wk. 4)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Quarter is off to a fine start in all arenas as \$25,000 check is picked up for global Development (making \$27,500 for week). Area Council produces team of 10 permeators and timeline is created for Montreal GWF.

Internal: Quarter III Area Council meets in two locations with Emerging Generation structure, "The Chosen in '79," held in new rent-free facility.

Contradiction: Building strategy in midst of House moving. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Major mid-course remaneuver is done on Week II with colleagues for Halton stronghold and London/Toronto regions. Implementaries are set out for the next 26 weeks.

Internal: Space shuffle and new decor indicate new missional impetus as Christina Deloughery arrives to increase those assigned to the House by 125%.

Contradiction: Taking even the smallest advantage and access, and turning them into the great leap forward. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Fishers are off on first visit to Sudbury Region this year. Two are sent packing to HDTS. Toronto House and metro colleagues join in Week II of materials writing and editing.

Internal: House is thrown into re-evaluation of all internal structures in preparation for two sojourners next week.

Contradiction: Reaching consensus on and sticking to the long-range priorities in midst of quickly changing situation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: A four-hour joint board meeting to decide new policies shows the responsibility being accepted by community leadership. The momentum builds for the Dieppe saturation with 21 community people attending the workshop leaders training session. The promotion campaign takes off with a bang with radio and television spots, articles in the newspapers, buttons, posters and flyers delivered to every house.

Internal: Moncton outpost acquires facility, sends out 12 resumes and does preparation for Dieppe saturation.

Contradiction: Continuing trend of community to decide its future while meeting objective deadlines. (Wk. 5)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Trips to Colombia and Curacao open up impact courses and Development prospects. Updating the Bishop of the State of Miranda (Bernal-Ortiz) reveals his close ties with the new Venezuelan government and receives promise of letter of Cardinal in Lima.

Internal: House experiences New Year's as discontinuity.

Contradiction: Re-imaging House as colleagues working with the village, rather than as employers or patrons. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: A villager takes charge of the preschool due to program shifts for the summer, 25 women meet to plan a women's event, and farmers write an installment plan to pay old electricity bills for their well.

Internal: Helen Haug announces decision to intern.

Contradiction: Keeping a newly launched ship afloat while finishing the hull. (Wk. 5)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Carrots are planted, and okra and zucchini are harvested at demonstration farm. Arrangements are made to begin eye testing in Rio Bonito for Bananeiras residents who need glasses. Public health nurse and dentist arrive for Saturday afternoon talks on first aid, medical and dental services to Bananeiras women's group, preschool and youth,

and make plans to return to train health caretakers and do diagnostic and preventative dentistry. Dr. Marcos plans curriculum for infant/mothers course. Seven health caretakers are recruited in the five stakes. Community comprehensive health program is presented at the community meeting. Development scores \$2,500 (US) from Citibank, \$1,000 from Otis Elevator and \$1,000 from IBM in one week.

Internal: A new facility, next to the *barraca*, is obtained for classrooms, living space and the preschool.

Contradiction: Setting up new health programs and services in the midst of Bananeira's geographic isolation. (Wk. 5)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The first week of the new year is filled with work and celebrations, highlighted by the first workday on the new 50 acre co-op farm, stake clean-up in preparation for the WCC visitors, and a community dance and slide show of the 24, narrated by Fr. Davila.

Internal: The House goes into orbit visioning the next 10 years with the Panchayat and celebrates the work with dinner and song at the Pegasus Hotel.

Contradiction: Launching the ITI without dropping the ball elsewhere. (Wk. 5)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: A hectic week of Development and Panchayat visit produces authorization, money, a pump and electric poles, and ends with a surprise visit from the Governor, who is so pleased by singing that he commissions a song for the whole Department of *El Progreso*.

External: Jean and Phil Holmes arrive from Beloit to work for a month in health and agriculture, sharing their experiences in Cano Negro, El Bayad, Termine, Vogar and Lorimor.

Contradiction: Organizing to enable full-time Development and full-time sustaining on-going programs vital to local credibility. (Wk. 5)

WEEK FIVE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports representatives are sent out to global band meeting in Brussels. Global systems trek is sent out from Chicago for four months. Sam Hanson reports on the ICA and its work to the Presidential Commission on World Hunger in Washington, D.C. All zones report global engagement of metro colleagues on circuits and a new readiness on the part of the private sector to adopt Projects and participate in those Projects. The key contradiction lies in the arena of firmly articulating the death ground for this quarter, to provide a comprehensive plan for the new orbit of funding that is out there.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports *SEAPAC Soundings* is published from Hong Kong Nexus. A public image PSU is held in Chicago in midst of serious struggle to articulate global story (apart from selling programs). The Global Film debuts and the pilot phase is launched; and the Global Academy Post goes on the road to develop prospects and catalyze House recruitment. Academy treks catalyze regional recruitment mailings and build House strategies for getting the word out to the prospects about the Quarter IV Academy. Already 22 are coming with eight weeks recruiting time left. The key contradiction lies in the arena of objective assessment being very difficult due to non-product/statistics orientation; having made significant breakthroughs in aircraft design, the plane is still not flying.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Bombay celebrates the first 100 villages in *Nava Gram Prayas*, and plans the Lightning Strike Campaign in which five strike forces (agriculture, industry, corporate action, environment and welfare) work simultaneously in the six spotlight villages. Hong Kong reports the second cluster village Consult in Malingin, the first actually within Lapu Lapu City. USAID spends a day and a half at Chicago Nexus doing the second phase of evaluation after visiting El Bayad and Woburn Lawn HDPs. Phoenix Houses catalyzes TMs in Deming, New Mexico, involving two percent of the town's population.

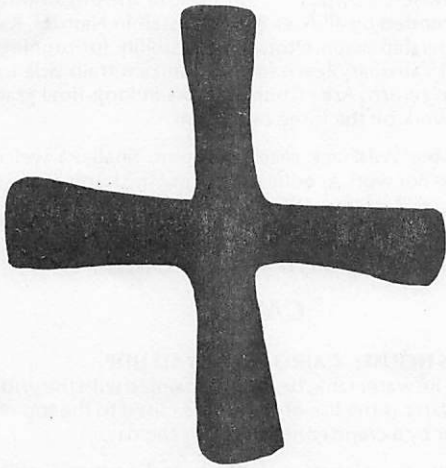
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that ICA receivables, payables are up to date for Australia ICA, Brussels, ICA/OE. Taiwan audit receives A-1 report from auditor. In Chicago, all the last minute scurrying for troop and material readiness takes place while preparing for the internal audit and global band meeting, the audio visual lab prepares to triple its space for media experimentation. New procedures are emerging to release troops to create strike force maneuvers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of setting up systems which anticipate practical, futuristic responses to the global vision yet can be presently handled by anyone.

External: Local delegates to Termine Europe Projects meeting report on event being great celebration with House. Major highlight is closing address in three languages. Visit to Intermediate Technology Industrial Services (ITIS) reveals great potential resource for HDPs around the globe for technical assistance in developing local industry.

Internal: Sr. Joyce Blackwell, Sacred Heart sister who met us first in Cano Negro, visits House and expresses serious interest in using methods in local community and with her Order.

Contradiction: Concentrating on finding the open doors instead of beating heads against the brick walls. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Renton community meeting reveals long-term results of the methods and possibility of a TM. The Greenoch Metro is initiated. Outstanding Development is sorted out, giving new picture of where House stands.

Internal: Fine House Church with two metro families and an old metro colleague at *Alternatives* ecclesiola are signs of new participation.

Contradiction: Accelerating the campaign with specific polis maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Tai'rgwaith leadership struggles with their role in the global band when Michael Ziegler arrives from Germany for a two-month stay. Roswitha Gans comes to do an article for ITT on this model village. Termine, Italy beckons them constantly. Great cheering greets the first two yeses for the Project meeting in Termine.

Internal: House enjoys movie *Force 10 From Navarone* which turns out to be surprisingly full of great images for Project acceleration.

*Thus says Yahweh:

All of this was made by my hand
and all of this is mine—it is Yahweh who speaks.

Contradiction: Locating the key that catalyzes commitment and urgency. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Four *Forum Communautaire* are held in four different polises.

Internal: First ecclesiola event of the quarter has guests Stan and Patti Mathews.

Contradiction: Doing the whole area—actually and practically. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The abandoned building provided by the municipality for the factory gets a beautiful sign erected, rubble cleared, and some windows installed. Security blinds and roof tiles are on order. The first GCF circuit for the quarter goes to Venice, phones in with one meeting set, all housing and food inkinded so far. The Sisters of Charity approve large grants for India and Termine industry. Three new Italian PR pieces are designed and run off. Guardian mailing goes out to 27.

Internal: Tom Greyshock and two sojourners, one German and one Canadian, swell troops in Termine for reconstruction of industry building.

Contradiction: Changing the "hibernation in January" story in the village to full speed ahead. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Presentation on cooperatives by representative from Lagos State Ministry starts leadership/guild meetings for the quarter with a big bang and opens up first serious possibility for bulk-buying. Wild creativity results in creating samples for new products for the sewing industry. Kaduna circuit is sent out to do GWF and CYF, with Alhaji Salu as Ijede representative. Canadian High Commission promises funds for trip on condition that they observe chicken projects in the North.

Internal: Development PSU involves everyone in writing proposals and making decor.

Contradiction: Putting tools for self-starting into the hands of the community and the public sector. (Wk. 6)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus receives notification of two grants from Rome order and Milan Foundation. GCF continental symbol, a bulls eye, is distributed to all Houses.

Internal: First round of India staff are in and out for visa renewal.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering to meet all January bottom-lines for all centrums. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Teams experiment with all known forms of TM set-up, including mail/phone set-ups and Week I and II circuits. Two-week Development push raises \$3,900.

Internal: New TM decor in two languages is printed by regional colleague while her car goes on circuit.

Contradiction: Ensuring back-up systems to cover emerging gaps in rapid TM set-up without slowing momentum. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Area Council produces geography-oriented maneuvers, creating new corporateness in going for broke on TM in the Benelux. CYF trek of Paul Schrijnen to Nigeria produces over \$500 in developed travel monies.

Internal: House moves out of present facility and into colleagues' homes as first step in self-support maneuver.

Contradiction: Deciding the symbol of victory that will sustain House on the road in finding a new facility quickly. (Wk. 4)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The Area TM team meets after its first two weeks of three teams operating independently and celebrates three victories (six TMs held and eight new polises set up). The team's reflection identifies complexity of scheduling, diversity of "sales pitch", and coordination with formulation and Development as arenas for next team meeting agenda.

Internal: The House sees *Holocaust* at the U.S. military theatre the week before it is put on local television and becomes the number one topic of conversation across the nation.

Contradiction: Living in the urgency without going over the edge into panic. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: After community quarter planning, new community task force assignments are made, a great neighborhood TM is held with 15 from one apartment building, and the first methods training session with 12 around table concludes week with Saturday night celebration. Two students from Darmstadt join the Project for three-month practicum. Workshop on housing model nets new legal Guardian.

Internal: Area prior's visit and new internal structures catalyze new sense of missional corporateness.

Contradiction: Creating a practical vision of relationship between Project and ICA. (Wk. 5)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: "Rise-Up Africa" is the spirit of the Bi-Continental Council attended by all Area Kinshasa staff in Nairobi. Kapini village leadership assume total responsibility for running the Project as 15 auxiliary leave for the Tamzam train ride to the council. On return, Area Council draws in long-time grads to Kapini for work on the three campaigns.

Internal: Meg Wildhack reaches Kapini, finally, a welcome return since her work as educator during the Kapini Consult.

Contradiction: Re-creating comprehensive Project picture in midst of community move to become engulfed in particular programs that are high-security, low-risk. (Wk. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The water tank, beautifully painted with the grid and phrase, "Water is the life of Bayad," is raised to the top of the water tower by a crane contributed for the day.

Internal: House celebrates Western and Eastern Christmas with staggered discontinuities to visit Egypt and two great Christmas feasts.

Contradiction: Building on the excitement of the water system victory to intensify Bayad leadership. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: First saturation team of Quarter III on the road to Kakamega reports that five Village Meetings have been completed in four and one-half days. Team also reports they are tired, but isn't it great! First stake planning in demonstration stake gathers 35 people of Kabiro who really do planning. Mr. Warui of Ministry of Commerce and Industry visits to look for ways to help, particularly in marketing. KYC begins with over 600 children enrolled; 200 more from KYC move into primary school. Door to door visiting takes place in all stakes.

Internal: Swirl of "Africa on the Move" is created as Hawa, Alberto and Samuel apply for ID cards and Anne, Lucy and Nelson work toward passports in order to enable travel across nation and continent.

Contradiction: Planning in detail with propensity to just act. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Assistant Commissioner of Social Services, Community Development Officer, and Esther Keli spend one hour in Kamweleni reviewing the submitted proposal for 350,000F. House receives 4,000 shillings for self-support from the CDO. Five preschool teachers arrive back to Kamweleni after one week training in Kawangware. Thirty community people demolish old mud houses in the community center.

Internal: Abedniko, Daudi and Jonathan Barnes spend three days roofing the community center in Kamweleni.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between emerging leadership and old leadership. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Two villages attend Kendur spotlight campaign meeting and decide that if Maliwada is really the demonstration village, its last four old houses must be torn down and rebuilt.

Hindu New Year's is celebrated with much dancing, singing and red paint powder. HDTs begins with 200 students.

Internal: All school staff moves into the ashram to fill up the rooms.

Contradiction: Ensuring adequate representation of all groups of villagers in the village association for registration. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Newly assigned strike force teams meet to plan four-week campaign in the six spotlight villages. Teams sent out and meet back on weekend to finalize timeline, bringing enthusiastic villagers with them to help in planning.

Internal: Nexus received the first contingent of Management Centrum into Bombay to prepare for audit.

Contradiction: Equipping the troops on the field to do effective and catalytic actuation, not just for one village but for the 232. (Wk. 5)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghaziabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is re-vamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for harigans. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Colleagues in Ranchi are revisited as part of continuing to build support and momentum for Area Calcutta buffer launching.

Internal: House regathers after Sikroar HDP Consult in Area Delhi and funding and authorization treks in Bihar.

Contradiction: Finalizing details of company sponsorship. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Nexus and global team visit to Foreign Affairs Protocol Officer initiates formal top level process of legalization.

Internal: *Lion of Singapore*, musical play about Sir Stamford Raffles and the founding of modern Singapore, impacts House with timeliness of dealing with bureaucrats.

Contradiction: Lining up external clout in order to ensure a win on registration. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Global strike force from Chicago and Area Singapore arrives to help prepare for Chief Minister's visit, February 7th. Guardian net begins to emerge in Kota Kinohalu as private sector and government officials all work to ensure a great visit by Chief Minister. The village is transformed with whole village working together. Documents arrive right before Chief Minister's visit. Road is leveled to Serusup, new ferry landing is built and a workday at beach prepares for picnic which follows visit to village. Chief Minister has great visit, promises his support and sets up meeting for ICA to meet with him relative to needs of Project.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates New Year's Eve at Minister of Social Welfare's party and attends holiday parties during discontinuity at key private and government official homes.

Contradiction: Getting village leadership intimately involved in subactics and assuming the responsibility for success of Project. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGLAI LUI

External: Two weeks of the Wedge team turn everything upside down and inside out revealing unforeseen mysteries and bringing new context to old situation. All Board of Directors are seen and financial commitments pledged to include Peggy-Heng Tsu Cheng. The Australian Connection with Nylex tightens up Nylex relationship here from old-time supporter to sponsor of upcoming Guardians meeting. Bridge begun during Consult is now open to traffic. Canadian money deposited—M\$10,559 besides 1500 developed. Quarterly report is mailed to 630 supporters.

Internal: Clare Michael is hired as a training consultant by Kentucky Fried Chicken for Malaysia and begins work the next day.

Contradiction: Taking the next steps that will mean all the difference in the future and finding strength in those who really care about Sungai Lui. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Bubun USAID proposal is approved and Bontoa proposal submitted. House begins five weeks maneuver planning. Third lot of chickens begin laying eggs.

Internal: House sends James Chia out to do Development trek in Singapore.

Contradiction: Motivating secretariat to be a key leadership and a decision-making body. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Vistors come from Ministry of Internal Affairs and SEKAB (Cabinet) in Jakarta before final signing of agreement with Indonesian government. Ten provincial officials spend night in Bubun at Governor's request to see what has happened since the Consult. The week of preparation includes flowers planted, new doctor in residence at clinic, and two women leading weekly maneuver meeting. Villagers get new life from hearing their own reports and answering hard questions as to their plans for the future of the Project

Internal: Early Sunday celebrative meal is capped off with the return of Friday night's chicken dinner which had flown away and ice cold cokes all around.

Contradiction: Creating a timeline to include all necessary activities, yet overcome the tiredness and frustration from so many possibilities and demands. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: In the great week of preparing the ground, the economic survey is finished to prepare data for USAID

proposal. The preschool parents' meeting reveals enthusiasm about further education for their children, which had been questioned. The ICA and Bontoa story and slides are shared at a meeting of the foreign funding agencies in South Sulawesi. LPPM, the nearby rice research institution blitzes the fertilizer demo plot donated by local farmer.

Internal: House tackles a self-support workshop and lays a plan, and closes the week with day of fasting.

Contradiction: Relating specific guild activities to total Project structures. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: First issue of *SEAPAC Soundings*, a continental campaign news magazine, is mailed to the zone, continent, and the centrums.

Internal: Collegiums on Profound Humanness and profound functions of Development signal and catalyze further brooding.

Contradiction: Discerning the next creative leap so that depth meaning is uncovered in all that needs to be done. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Elders Forum is held. Hong Kong International School participates on New Year's workday, painting signs, bathrooms, etc. Dental clinic materials are costed. Attendance at Amcham anniversary keeps up contact with business Guardians.

Internal: Sushila Joshi visits and teaches in Elders Forum.

Contradiction: Tying up economic aspects of Project before Chinese New Year deadline. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4-H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Meeting with national YMCA staff sets stage for second wave of GCFs covering the Philippines. Multi-national supporters are blitzed with personalized gifts of Sudtonggan abbaca craft and Sudtonggan HDP photograph.

Internal: Week of Christmas celebration meals with parish people is capped by New Year's House meeting and celebration at Manila Peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating a metamorphoses in sustaining models to make "the leap." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House receives unconditional statement from auditor verifying accuracy of ICA: Taiwan financial statement of 1978. Fourteen Development appointments uncover new potential support from global firms such as RCA and Bank of America.

Internal: Taipei House hosts Hong Kong Development Centrum for circuit, and Hai Ou for investment visits to raise capital for Project's "fry stocking business", which stocks fishponds.

Contradiction: Creating legal and financial structures for Hai Ou economic acceleration while establishing the urgency to move on TM in Taiwan. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Two Consults on same weekend stretches tent as "blue shirts" take on new roles as unit leaders/enablers guns and continue to be the mysterious blue troops who ride into town and help transform villages in three days. Four Consults are now completed, with 300 newly signed-on buri furniture workers, 400 newly enrolled pre-schoolers, 50 newly plowed hectares of corn, four kilometers of rock-lined roads, four 12 x 4 foot entrance signs, and one combined 125-page document in the printing.

Internal: ICA staff clothes given out as raffles during Christmas return after fire.

Contradiction: Locating more blue cloth. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Sewing industry gets wholesale material from Manila and begins mass production of kimonos. Biggest department store in Davao shows interest and orders samples of clothing items. Section II of training center is completed and work begins on Section III which will be the sewing industry section. Preschool takes field trip to Coke plant.

Internal: House completes move into training center just as old house begins to fall down. Potot children arrive from Sudtonggan, bringing total Emerging Generation to 16.

Contradiction: Creating the long-range community plans. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Global Women's Forum is held with university girls, most of whom have had RS-I and been to Oyubari. Seven of them trek to the new House at the close of the Forum.

Internal: House moves to new 19-room Japanese-style house.

Contradiction: Starting the field maneuvers on Week 4 with power and secured victory. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: First CYF with Presbyterian Youth Assembly, Jeju Island, is held with 40 present and a great event! Three villagers meet with auxiliary in workshop to lay out plan for preschool registration. Private grain mill owners and village leaders journey to county office to deal with issues in securing a common grain mill.

Internal: Ten university sojourners (7 men, 3 women) participate enthusiastically in a sojourn/intern training plan including common Order structures, Daily Office, ecclesiola, House Church plus global language and *kimchee* making.

Contradiction: Mobilizing through near-sighted immediacies. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: A trip to the city of Togo in prefecture is a surprise as House finds they are already using the TM methods. House continues to lay the groundwork in prefecture for Town Meetings. Prior makes a trip to Okinawa to investigate new leads for HDP. Capucian Fathers grant 50,000 yen, and a

proposal is in the works for Coca-Cola to help fund the TM workbooks for the upcoming February maneuver..

Contradiction: Communicating the urgency of present maneuvers to task force colleagues. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Walking into a rural prefectural office without a translator yields a big office stir—five men coming forward to speak in English, and much very valuable information in the form of maps, statistics, charts. Over 150,000 yen in Development monies, five guests present for ecclesiola (four from different companies of the same Company group), and two LENS luncheons help to round out the week.

Internal: A two-week English intensive is accomplished through nightly "dining out", and nets 100,000 yen permeation monies.

Contradiction: Rehearsing the timing of the dance. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Metro circuits go in two directions to Erimo and Takikawa, visiting Guardians, recruiting LENS, and exploring opportunities for new Community Youth Forums. One more Town Meeting is set up with the confirmation of dates. Stake visitation in Oyubari reveals new opportunities for community activities.

Internal: The House sends out the Shaw family to new assignment in Tokyo.

Contradiction: Expanding the community's image of local development. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygant family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Waitering and waitressing at Christmas dinner for family of Perth millionaire nets \$100 tip for sustenance coffers.

Internal: House sends Karen and John to Community Training Consultation in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Hanging ten while the external situation pushes House to hang fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: CTC strike force of Barry Oakley and Terry Weygant arrive to collect \$100 from state committee member and \$500 from Nabisco as the first of their annual gifts for 1979 and 1980. Transrational models for state campaigns are taking new forms.

Internal: Finance forms are brought up to date and ready for audit.

Contradiction: Forging regional models that will release Area Council consensus without pre-empting that consensus. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Planning for next six months' broad maneuvers goes on at Murrin Bridge, with Holcombes and Banks in 50°C (130°F) midsummer heat wave. Inkind continues and preparation are made for visit by Petersville to vegetable industry possibilities next week at Murrin Bridge.

Internal: Several hundred dollars are saved by doing valve grind at home on House car.

Contradiction: Getting House finances together prior to Area Council. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Two CMAs are held and Crow's Nest core meeting sets a date in February. Development proposals follow-up and 10 appointments with new prospects begin to open doors.

Internal: House yard is transformed with the use of a sickle to tear away overhanging trees and five-foot-high weeds, revealing undiscovered garden plants.

Contradiction: Allowing the region to be engaged now while building the story around next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Industry team is sent to Sydney with two community people, meeting with David Jones regarding the garbage can trolley. Two are sent to Community Training Consult in Adelaide by bus. Two past town residents, visiting from Sydney drive out to coach Murrin Bridge youth in tennis techniques.

Internal: House is transformed prior to Federal ministers' visits on December 19th.

Contradiction: Confronting the community with their self-story of the future in the midst of engagement. (Wk. 5)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Quarter III is launched with increased stake meeting participation. The Preschool Guild recruits for the PTA from a government-provided school bus. The stake around the demonstration space works on a maintenance model and the showplace re-creates the garden fence. The first radio news show from the showplace is produced and aired on Saturday as the first of a weekly program for the quarter. The Area Suva TM team in Guam does a demonstration TM for the Guam legislature.

Internal: Bright yellow Majuro House water catchment enlivens Stake V and Deana Henry's contract extension enables the House budget to be in the black for the year.

Contradiction: Developing a Guardian net that will bridge the gap between the strong local showplace colleagues and the high-level authorization. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: In the midst of celebration which triples village population, program visibility is maintained with community signs posted, village flag raised, and new toilets constructed. Apia businessman offers on the job training for two people in his bakery and the promise of support for Salani bakery.

Internal: Ecclesiola study on hunger and nutrition and conversation on action gets "Ohyes" response from all present.

Contradiction: Holding the tension of knowing how to move "strike forces" quickly with methods, and using wisdom to create necessary back up systems which allow long-range winning. (Wk. 5)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Life blossoms in metro cadres as Sacramento calls for the metro meeting—"We need to take responsibility for the mission here".

Internal: Joseph Iida visits on his return from Jamaica and reports on the WCC Central Committee during ecclesiola with seven colleagues at the table.

Contradiction: Creating the weekly implementation model which enables the large jigsaw puzzle to be built step-by-step. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Survey and cost estimate for each house in town is completed in preparation for HUD application. After school program takes first field trip—24 to McDonald's in Spokane.

Internal: House's chimney collapses, but auxiliary doesn't; repair is done at midnight in subzero weather.

Contradiction: Ensuring that HUD pre-application is written. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: The Cascade Eclipse Maneuver is designed with all colleagues assigned and launched with set up in three simultaneous strongholds. Break loose in LENS openings at top levels. Bainbridge Island wealth is penetrated. Pledge letter and proposals are prepared.

Internal: Study of Panchayat report and launch of maneuvers trigger redesign of House space creating new office and an extra guest room.

Contradiction: Doing the preparation which ensures rapid catalytic set-up. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Overall strategic review session breaks loose authentic way to configure into regional impact and building the Movement taskforces. House becomes the training center with a kickoff training night on the ECF.

Internal: Ecclesiola is led by metro colleagues with 17 around table to take first look at Alternatives and write riddles.

Contradiction: Building the story that will allow people to risk with confidence and move with courage. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House completes Deming maneuver with 10 TMs in

Southwest New Mexico. Roman Catholic Bishop Flores' diocese of El Paso is visited and will support TM in his parishes.

Internal: House sends the Filipski family to Richgrove HDP.

Contradiction: Reorganizing maneuvers around smaller House staff. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Agricultural Day becomes a happening as eight university of Arizona consultants tour the District with 15 cattlemen and become excited about possibilities for range improvement.

Internal: House experiences cruciality of comprehensive Sunday morning planning on the other side of a week overflowing with actualized tactics.

Contradiction: Building consensus on fast-changing priorities. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: U.S. mails become the missional arm with the mailing to 20 school superintendents for CYF scheduling and funding for Quarter II, and 45 Panchayat invitations sent.

Internal: Self-support momentum increases as tax season overtime boosts income and "old boys" network becomes operational in high paying job pursuit.

Contradiction: Keeping TM vibrant in people's minds in the face of limited on-the-road time. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: The Human Development Corporation Board meets to receive victory reports—especially, the day care affiliating with the reservation-wide comprehensive community services, and increased sales in the cafe, store and the Trash Barro Industry. The Board plans on new insurance to protect corporate property and decides to continue as a Vista sponsor.

Internal: The Youth of the House garner set of encyclopedias and assorted bingo prizes on inkind trip to Bismark.

Contradiction: "Moving right along" in the face of the lurking potential for deterioration existing in every program. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inked wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Preparing the financial statement and annual report for ICA annual meeting initiates Houses's two-week Public Accountability Maneuver.

Internal: First ecclesiola of the quarter creates mood of anticipation for future seminars challenging and creating world view.

Contradiction: Capping and naming the victory so that momentum can be passed on to the new maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Three campaigns spin together producing a local Nanaimo frame, \$1300 in-hand for Development and intensified engagement through North Vancouver slide show—one to Guardians meeting and one consultant to Minto.

Internal: House welcomes Yvonne Meyers (back from Australia) and Tickner family to House Church.

Contradiction: Utilizing regional resources to increase the momentum of Development and saturation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Saturation moves ahead with one TM, four CYFs and two GWFs working in the Fairbanks metro. A Night at the Institute presents Minto and provides great excitement. Consultant registration develops \$1500 in-hand and \$1700 working.

Internal: Andrew Roberts comes home, Tim Wright arrives from Chicago to begin work in Fairbanks, and Yvonne Meyers arrives from Vancouver to work on HDP Consult prep.

Contradiction: Moving strategically in midst of pre-Consult minutia. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Development maneuver is typed and appointment set with colleague to move Saskatoon saturation maneuver down the road.

Internal: Ecclesiola is celebrated with new troop configuration.

Contradiction: Discerning the necessary direction for program in midst of nailing down self-support. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Vogar Voice is well moved, 18-month report is mailed and invitation to open house is mailed.

Internal: Auxiliary spends a day working in Vogar Products.

Contradiction: Creating events of useful leadership. (Wk. 5)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Panchayat visit refreshes spirit of House with a global update and fine reception with over 35 in attendance. The Houston Hustle Maneuver starts with two meetings of colleagues, a CYF in a private high school and possibility of training new leaders as a result of GWF in Huntsville.

Internal: Inked celebration of pizza, beer and sandwiches is enjoyed by House and Panchayat.

Contradiction: Meshing pivot city networks with the maneuver neighborhood geography to keep integrity to the task. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: The Voice is distributed to the whole community for communication of the public hearing Thursday night for the HUD grant (CDBG).

Internal: House celebrates twice in one day: with community at Homecoming and with Christina Slicker for her birthday.

Contradiction: Designing the pressure defense to make sure troops are in winning position. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Asherton holds a GWF. Library workday with rug, curtains and new door completes the building. Town Meeting maneuver completes 16 events, with nine more to go.

Internal: Two celebrations are held to send out the Murdochs.

Contradiction: Discerning the key victory for the quarter. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Town Meeting set-up meetings are scheduled every night of the week, three TMs are set, and circuiting maneuver is completed.

Internal: Colleagues meet with excitement around ecclesiola during Alternatives study on world hunger.

Contradiction: Looking continually for places where more than one maneuver can be accomplished in the same action. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House makes presentation to Highland Park UMC Community Outreach Committee for financial support of global social demonstration. Meeting with director of the Goals for Dallas Alliance, Chamber of Commerce and the Women's Center begin to frame Dallas cluster for June.

Internal: The seminary study pushes the 11 colleagues of the ecclesiola covenant group into depth dialogue with the world.

Contradiction: Setting up four saturation maneuvers catalytically. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Governor Finch attends TM in North Biloxi and comes away ecstatic. Fifteen TMs are held and eight more set up. Total now held or scheduled is over 100. Forty attend Jaycees second annual *Womenless Wedding* and talent show. Xerox commits \$500 for preschool. Community development block grant application is submitted for housing subdivision site development.

Internal: Another car increases mobility from one car to two.

Contradiction: Creating the maneuver that will establish the vision of the next two years when first two-year vision is essentially done. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: While getting a running start on Louisiana Marksville Maneuver, House orchestrates six Mississippi Town Meetings, including North Bay area of Biloxi with 101 participants plus Governor Finch.

Internal: Student cluster reaps 14A's on report cards, celebrate school homecoming, and two are selected for Prep Quiz Bowl on TV.

Contradiction: Living out of one corporate comprehensive screen while troops are widely dispersed. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mississippi 200 reports start of awakening is going on in that state. Memphis region inked printing and sends out 100 formal invitations for the global slide show and Evening at the Institute, and colleague night—all in one—to friends, Guardians and Development contacts.

Internal: Job hunting continues, enabled by *How to Get a High-Paying Job* study and Thursday ecclesiola during collegium.

Contradiction: Remembering the global strategy when the parochial insists on consuming your being. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First Town Meeting training event is held to reinforce a series of scheduled neighborhood TMs. HUD visits to view proposed plan to work in local neighborhood.

Internal: House receives a visitor from Switzerland for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Forcing momentum to elicit glue in an urban stronghold. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Decision to hold authorization event accelerates finishing touches to front rooms of community center.

Internal: VISTA supervisors' grant breaks open two past House checks and puts self-support within realistic reach.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensiveness in the midst of community focusing on school redistricting. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The House visits colleagues Ron and Sue Nixon in West Palm Beach. Late night conversation and next day planning clarify plans for future stronghold there. Ecclesiola format is utilized for youth sponsors from the church who meet for the first time at the House. A community development official gets excited about using Town Meetings in Orlando.

Internal: The last items from storage are moved to the newly-rented House and a search for other furniture begins.

Contradiction: Holding the long range vision while moving the immediate mountain. (Wk. 6)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: LENS set up is done with Georgia Pacific, Seattle First National, Department of Transportation and Pioneer National Bank in Seattle. The next six months of the *Journal* are made print-ready. Rotary International invites the ICA to prepare an article on Rotarian participation in HDPs and TMs. Four hundred tickets are sold for the UPtown 5 Valentine Ball.

Internal: Three are sent out on the Management Centrum internal audit trek to each nexus and band meeting in Brussels.

Contradiction: Planning the agonizing, practical details which give substance to doing. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Environmental Maintenance Company is finally approved for city funding of \$100,000 and HDTS begins in Fifth City with 40+ participants. Commercial corporation task force completes first full week and celebrates grocery store's biggest day ever—\$7400 gross sales.

Internal: Major snowstorm adds fluff to birthday celebrations of Lela Mosley (50) and Tad and Todd Mueller (12).

Contradiction: Experiencing weather conditions as victimizing House into starting quarter without context, i.e. no quarter calendar. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Community assembly finally happens after being postponed by one snowstorm and threatened by another. Preschool opens with fourteen. Every household income survey is completed for community HUD block grant application.

Internal: Regional workday transforms collegium room, Emerging Generation room, and kitchen.

Contradiction: Creating a focus for each guild in the midst of many possibilities. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Global Women's Forum with 27 participants is recruited through help of article in *About Town* column in *Kansas City Star*. Metro cadre meetings are held in Lincoln and Omaha, plus workday in Lorimor.

Internal: House holds GWF pedagogy on Sunday morning.

Contradiction: Catalyzing metro cadres to set up strongholds. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Ten events are held in the Eau Claire area to complete the third regional stronghold. The participants of the city-wide assembly engage seriously in the task of defining, on behalf of the city's grassroots, the implications for action for the future.

Internal: Over thirty metro colleagues enable and cater three international benefit buffets with over 20 dishes from around the world, Claire Clements' Indian dancing and the global film.

Contradiction: Defining structures of immediate and concrete engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Multiple visits result in multiple events in towns over 800.

Internal: House functions in spite of sole occupant's broken ankle.

Contradiction: Getting all events set in limited time to avoid protracted campaign. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Preschool workday with 43 people accomplishes six weeks of work in one day using \$350 in kind materials and giving preschool four months advance rent.

Internal: Leda McClennan and Anna Rusky's sojourn makes preschool training available and offers promise of fully stocked perennial plants for garden, equipment for bakery and constant supply of food staples.

Contradiction: Working together as a smooth precision instrument giving unified thrust to diversified demands for engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Winter Frolic meeting attendance jumps to 14, as caps and buttons are ordered, activities planned, timeline consensus reached, and everyone is involved.

Internal: Whole House journeys to Minneapolis for all or part of the week in great "\$5440 or Fight" blitz to erase Kinney deficit with antiques, labor pool jobs, bazaar, dinner and even blood!

Contradiction: Turning the Winter Frolic into a key push on visibility, stakes, guilds, etc. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Alderman and senior citizens seek out House and provide key to saturation. Snow requires endless program shifts and provides opportunity to celebrate life as it is.

Internal: Strange angels provide a short-term, well-paid job in Chicago and a stimulating visit by Marilie Blanchard.

Contradiction: Remaining open to new possibilities relative to saturation while new data constantly sharpens focus and shifts previous plans. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: An exciting new Assembly construct is tested halfway through *Top of the State* stronghold, releasing a strong core and dramatic momentum for additional TMs and impact courses. Bob Bain and ten Purdue sociology students brave snow to participate in Mill Shoals preschool set-up workday and Butler University hosts 33 for GWF in Indianapolis. Four cadre meetings come off, including Bloomington's second one in two weeks.

Internal: Maneuver screen for next two quarters is finished and whole House enjoys hosting Jack and Norma McKenzie (Jackie Speicher's parents).

Contradiction: Moving the cores on the next strongholds now. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Metro circuits yield 14 new people exposed to slide

show in Lexington. Saturation maneuver is planned for Columbus. Stronghold maintenance training events are set for Hamilton.

Internal: Quarter III launching celebration concludes with team and task assignment commissioning.

Contradiction: Sharpening and empowering new task team models for Quarter III. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Panchayat and House host two events—a guild meeting where regional framing is begun, and a meeting for clergy and lay who participated in Detroit saturation to discuss the role of the Church in the urban community.

Internal: Sixteen colleagues get involved as House readies and moves into free 16-room facility in one explosive week in time to receive Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Expanding the Guardian/patron base. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Ten metro colleagues plan for Quarter III Metro Council with House, and decide that the morning reporting session will write and publish a newsletter with features on Quarter II accomplishments.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 50 attending is highlighted by TM and GSD game, including three moves ahead for proper framing and two moves back for funding proposal failure.

Contradiction: Getting the three-year stronghold timeline, which is in everyone's mind, onto the wall. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: New York Area ground and strike force troops meet in the New York Region and report on the quick victories attained in the first three weeks of Quarter III. The highlight is the raising of \$5509 by area and Development Centrum forces in Pittsburgh region.

Internal: The materials room is transformed into a freshly painted and carpeted finance office.

Contradiction: Designing systems for the effective use of troops across the region. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Beyond all expectations, program development exceeds week's anticipated bottom line of \$1500 by coming in with over \$5000 in-hand.

Internal: House member receives job offer of \$15,600 to top last weeks offer of \$14,500.

Contradiction: Maintaining local momentum during shift to Regional saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Glen Falls and Western Finger Lakes maneuvers host groups are taking shape with prominent journalists, business people, educators and civic leaders of the areas. Global index system nears completion for business, colleagues and foundations.

Internal: House time design is altered as new job and mid-term exams occupy additional time.

Contradiction: Structuring work schedule to allow House to participate in corporate missional action. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Regional mailing reactivates names of all TM and RS-I or PLC grads with the help of mailing house. House prepares for Development focus.

Internal: Panchayat trek is anticipated as House studies trek report at collegium with Jay and Ann Antenen as guests.

Contradiction: Focusing full power on Development while Project goes on. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Development week uncovers colleagues around the state: two churches, ancillary industry possibilities, 30 gallons of inkind paint, copying facilities, and many caring individuals—but no cash. A \$42,000 CETA contract is signed to employ and to train all community youth ages 16 to 21 (and to aid auxiliary self-support).

Internal: Two-story residence is cleaned and utilities are turned on in preparation for auxiliary move to new centrally located facilities.

Contradiction: Building a schedule of events and meetings to allow full participation of community. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Banks in a Philadelphia stronghold not only respond favorably to funding requests but one manager suggests that three other of his branches need to sponsor and fund a Town Meeting as well as set up an Economic Community Forum.

Internal: Collegiums on the state of the globe and the state of the continent anticipate the Global Research Assembly as well as tie Philadelphia to other Houses around the globe.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the events that raise up, train and give confidence to local generals. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Regional maneuver focus on easy win, strategic win and dramatic win propel the forces into next two-week maneuvers.

Internal: Refining hostelry system facilitates smooth reception of guests and permeation income.

Contradiction: Planning the use of forces to do the task. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: A small house in the village is made available for the nursery school.

Internal: Braving snow and ice storms, the House and local youth celebrate Laura Griffin's birthday and go to see *Superman*.

Contradiction: Planning the work of the Project as events that change people's lives. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: The Development planning workshop provides an avenue for wider involvement by colleagues and creates new enthusiasm. An updated mailing list is completed and typed onto address labels. Every day of next week has an appointment for GCF scheduled.

Internal: Ecclesiola college and seminary allow for a serious exchange of opinions, and sodality is fun.

Contradiction: Maintaining organization and discipline to make sure that interest and enthusiasm result in programs and money. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Project task force teams in the economic arena and energy alternatives and savings arena meet to plan moves during winter and get out plan for the week. Cornell University voices interest in helping pull together financially and environmentally sound firewood proposal.

Internal: Guardians meeting in Schenectady with both new and old colleagues reveals strength that gives new courage.

Contradiction: Clarifying engagement of residents in emerging directions with specific tasks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two teams are sent out on first framing expedition to the quarter's two stronghold areas in Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, and Brockton, Massachusetts.

Internal: Special collegiums on seven revolutions and *Alternatives* give focus to local engagement.

Contradiction: Making full use of available local forces in exciting task. (Wk. 6)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: House receives 2500 inkind brochures for GWF and mailing is prepared for the 300 women's organizations of greater Montreal, both French and English.

Internal: Newly ordered internal life designed by House Council is dramatized by newly decorated collegium room in new House.

Contradiction: Making the shift from altering the blueprints to groundbreaking in Quebec. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House receives a key letter from chairman of regional municipality, the urban stronghold target, representing the first-ever public sector nod at regional provincial level in the Toronto Region.

Internal: New pieces of decor keep appearing to remind House that life is in a constant state of flux.

Contradiction: Creating saturation story that can stand in the midst of internal changing of saturation images. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sudbury City seems ripe for a saturation stronghold as North Leeds county chugs along. Both events will be funded by the provincial lottery at \$8,000 each. Development stays for a day to write up the northern Ontario HDP site selection and Consult proposal.

Internal: Sojourners, Robert Lapp and Nigel Weir, have a great time being on the road and participating in symbolic life, neither having any previous contact.

Contradiction: Staging the impact events for saturation major road blocks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: In the midst of working encounters with forty community people this week, the confidence of Lorne is revealed: rughookers create new designs and prototypes for Atlantic Trade Fair, LEDC management begins office remodeling, volunteer fire chief meets with municipal affairs officer, who decides to pay \$500 of 1978 payables for firehall.

Internal: The maneuver for individual nurture through small dinner parties with the leadership is great collegial event with two families to dinner and games Wednesday night.

Contradiction: Ensuring Project programs receive immediate funding and creating maneuver that wins three jobs in next two weeks. (Wk. 6)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Development week ends with \$12,000 in-hand and \$38,000 approved. *Foro Comunitario* (TM) caravans ready for Monday launch with 500 workbooks and set-up, Development and orchestration materials.

Internal: Panchayat visit brings global images and stories, and enables vision of future in Latin America.

Contradiction: Maintaining Project momentum while kicking off *Foro* campaign across Venezuela, and next phase of the Project. (Wk. 6)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: A villager takes charge of the preschool due to program shifts for the summer, 25 women meet to plan a women's event, and farmers write an installment plan to pay old electricity bills for their well.

Internal: Helen Haug announces decision to intern.

Contradiction: Keeping a newly launched ship afloat while finishing the hull. (Wk. 5)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Carrots are planted, and okra and zucchini are harvested at demonstration farm. Arrangements are made to begin eye testing in Rio Bonito for Bananeiras residents who need glasses. Public health nurse and dentist arrive for Saturday afternoon talks on first aid, medical and dental services to Bananeiras women's group, preschool and youth, and make plans to return to train health caretakers and do diagnostic and preventative dentistry. Dr. Marcos plans curriculum for infant/mothers course. Seven health caretakers are recruited in the five stakes. Community comprehensive health program is presented at the community meeting. Development scores \$2,500 (US) from Citibank, \$1,000 from Otis Elevator and \$1,000 from IBM in one week.

Internal: A new facility, next to the *barraca*, is obtained for classrooms, living space and the preschool.

Contradiction: Setting up new health programs and services in the midst of Bananeira's geographic isolation. (Wk. 5)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Community assembly celebrates past accomplishments and does hard-headed planning for the future. The tool pool shed is begun. Mead-Johnson guarantees to supply the health outpost for one year. Mr. Deth completes drawings for industrial complex.

Internal: Amos Grundahl arrives in time to help with the winter planting of the demonstration garden.

Contradiction: Moving industry contractor from contract to production. (Wk. 6)

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: A hectic week of Development and Panchayat visit produces authorization, money, a pump and electric poles, and ends with a surprise visit from the Governor, who is so pleased by singing that he commissions a song for the whole Department of *El Progreso*.

External: Jean and Phil Holmes arrive from Beloit to work for a month in health and agriculture, sharing their experiences in Cano Negro, El Bayad, Termine, Vogar and Lorimor.

Contradiction: Organizing to enable full-time Development and full-time sustaining on-going programs vital to local credibility. (Wk. 5)

WEEK SIX

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports all nexus gather in Brussels for Global Development band meeting, reported as "best strategic planning the band has ever done." Highlights include workshops: key needs of the 24 identified and funding targets named, and world frame chart created, bringing clarity on the available global clout which can be brought to bear on such corporations as IBM in USA. Great celebration is held at Greek restaurant with the spinning of ten years of Development stories. The battleplan to win the 5.5 million is created with 182 tactics listed, timed and in everyone's hands. Weekly exchange aerograms reporting these tactics prepare to fly around the world. The key contradiction lies in the arena of putting flesh on the tactics, keeping them before the centrum as the vehicle to victory.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the second session of the eighth grade Phase I RS-I. David McClesky spins with centrum on John Dunne and the creation of two and a half hour mini-retreat for 1,100 clergymen. Australian CTC produces ten-day auxiliary training construct for use in Projects. The recovery and inclusive context begins to inform the doing of total mission: empowering research. The key contradiction lies in the arena of inadequate means for this global group to think as one on the radical new being faced.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the completion of the Sudtonggan clusters with Hamjes and Vergaras as team leaders. Joseph Slicker's talk on social fabric occasions brooding on the "blue shirt" movement and the link between the local and regional resources. "Flagstaff PSU" with Development: Chicago Nexus forms practical operational linkage pertaining to funding, program fees and HDP acceleration. The key contradiction lies in the arena of outmoded delivery systems for interchange of missional models required by field engaged in multi-focused campaigns.

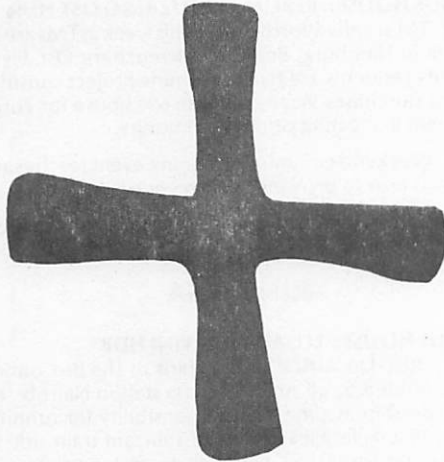
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Local delegates to Termine Europe Projects meeting report on event being great celebration with House. Major highlight is closing address in three languages. Visit to Intermediate Technology Industrial Services (ITIS) reveals great potential resource for HDPs around the globe for technical assistance in developing local industry.

Internal: Sr. Joyce Blackwell, Sacred Heart sister who met us first in Cano Negro, visits House and expresses serious interest in using methods in local community and with her Order.

Contradiction: Concentrating on finding the open doors instead of beating heads against the brick walls. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Circuit sets up TMs and CYFs in the Aberdeen Metro. Network catalysis begins across the North with new breakthroughs in the Glasgow area as car gives greater maneuverability.

Internal: Edinburgh House Church hosts five guests in first mobile common meal maneuver.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on anticipated regional victories to mobilize the next metro phase. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAIH HDP

External: Local leadership development intensifies as Management Board organizes and implements second community garden sale, local youth leads workshop at TM and three local people attend European Projects meeting at Termine.

Internal: Snow cuts off Tai'rgwaith, keeping whole village at home for massive but friendly snowball fight.

Contradiction: Making Project development visible in midst of winter condition. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two GCFs at Vanves, where the House is located and at Merobert in the Evry Polis, complete one-half of the urban Paris Metros with 15% of the population of Merobert participating: 40 people.

Internal: House sends out two members, Monique Le Guillou, French, and Ekkerhard Von Weiher, German, to Week 6 Belgian Wallonia stronghold maneuver.

Contradiction: Launching a maneuver advance for the remaining quarter while being absorbed by immediate maneuvers. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Bureaucracy is put in motion to allow repairs, electricity and water into the new industrial building. "Feet on the table" session breaks loose new images for the next two weeks, focusing on the visible sign of the industrial building in operation.

Internal: House sends out the remaining guests from the European Project meeting, and does major housecleaning.

Contradiction: Following up on all the possibilities without losing the major focus. (Wk. 7)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: The great week of launching agriculture begins with delivery of 1,000 naira (\$1,500 US) worth of chicken feed, followed by delivery of 1,200 chicks by Agric, the Ministry of Agriculture, which catalyzes an impromptu chicken house built by Achaji Salu. The Manpower Administration Manager of Pioneer Metal Company visits to inspect the partially completed new poultry building in preparation for granting in-kind request for roofing. Co-op stores and Kingsway stores request sewing industry samples, while the Ministry of Trade and Co-operatives enlists 38 founding members of the Ijede Co-Op. On the weekend, a fifty-woman GWF is held in Lagos at St. Paul's Church, while new CYF orchestrators, Jago and Coleman, pull off three events.

Internal: First of injection of new troops from Kenya, Peter Malaba, arrives and catalyzes demonstration auxiliary garden.

Contradiction: Initiating economic programs in midst of fear and uncertainty. (Wk. 7)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Hosting the Development band meetings spins global missional images for entire Nexus.

Internal: Collegium on Dunne grounds the climb up the mountain and draws responses relative to centrum participation and individual care.

Contradiction: Creating cross-centrum information vehicle for every centrum's data and wisdom. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Teams experiment with all known forms of TM set-up, including mail/phone set-ups and Week I and II circuits. Two-week Development push raises \$3,900.

Internal: New TM decor in two languages is printed by regional colleague while her car goes on circuit.

Contradiction: Ensuring back-up systems to cover emerging gaps in rapid TM set-up without slowing momentum. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House receives request to do a demonstration of the Dorpsdag for an all-day gathering of the *Welzijns Ambtenaren van Kleine Gemeenten: Overijssel*, or all the official "village well-being" people from the small groups of villages in the Province of Overijssel. House will finish polis coverage in that province by then, marking the first solid groundwork on network authorization for strongholds next year. Road troops spend the week in Brussels, working on an areal stronghold task force and enjoying the edges of the Development band meeting. With addition of one more from Amsterdam and two from Paris, the House has eight troops for the weekend. House sets up three TMs and does workshop leadership training all in one day, with a fine celebrative, reflective meal at the end.

Internal: Meeting with George Boskase, key Roman Catholic lay colleague, yields first promising inroad into the Catholic church in the Netherlands, particularly in reference to the possibility of a new facility.

Contradiction: Honoring a town's local situation, milieu, and timelines while challenging them by honoring House's timeline. (Wk. 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: While Hannerl and Bob Rank participate in the Global Development band meeting in Brussels, the Berlin bear and Tolman cover the donor circuit and find that sitting in the living room of TM participants has financial and formulation rewards. The Brea TM effort expands to five teams as the Berlin

House assigns Barbara Alerding to stake meetings in Kreuzberg Ost and Maria McGuire to Greater Berlin circuit.

Internal: House prepares for the apparent future by spending Week II in RS-I pedagogy led by the Alerdings.

Contradiction: Scheduling crucial corporate reflection time when time on the circuits is of such high value. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: TM acceleration happens this week as TMs are held in great style in Hamburg, Berlin and Kreuzberg Ost. Five local community residents are sent to Termine Project consultation. Colleague purchases Wrangelstrasse 690 house for corporate involvement in creating primal community.

Internal: Weekend community training event teaches artform methods on how to plan and run a meeting.

Contradiction: Symbolizing depth human issue which will unify Kreuzberg Ost. (Wk. 7)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: "Rise-Up Africa" is the spirit of the Bi-Continental Council attended by all Area Kinshasa staff in Nairobi. Kapini village leadership assume total responsibility for running the Project as 15 auxiliary leave for the Tamzam train ride to the council. On return, Area Council draws in long-time grads to Kapini for work on the three campaigns.

Internal: Meg Wildhack reaches Kapini, finally, a welcome return since her work as educator during the Kapini Consult.

Contradiction: Re-creating comprehensive Project picture in midst of community move to become engulfed in particular programs that are high-security, low-risk. (Wk. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Pipes connecting water tank to well are in place after marathon work day. All stakes initiate work and timelines for toilet and showers.

Internal: Margreet Farid is sent out to Europe and Phil Kneisley arrives to "green" the desert.

Contradiction: Training the leadership for now, while preparing them for the world's accountability. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Visitors from Ministry of Co-Op Development and Kenya National Farmers Co-Op are impressed with multi-purpose co-op in Kawangware. Stake focus in Kabiro begins to take form with great stake meeting and parent-teacher meeting. Roto-tiller is inkinded to do five acres. Mr. Kalibala of TAW International Leasing Company comes to guild meeting and gives advice on securing new industry for Kawangware, promising to return and give further assistance. Weekly target for Development is exceeded by 37%. LENS reports from saturation team continue to be great.

Internal: House goes to see *Piece of the Action* which helps to clarify role of conning and framing in effecting care.

Contradiction: Doing the "mission impossible" in order that every maneuver is a victory. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Thirty people show up at work days on Saturday to dig a community water pipe trench.

Internal: Dickson Muli joins House as sojourner.

Contradiction: Enabling community single mindedness in the pace of multiple opportunities. (Wk. 7)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Maliwada leadership generates economic ventures—a new brick factory and a *huann* shop (food store), which keeps adding items to its stock. The preschool is reactivated and many children are participating. As one of six spotlights for January, Maliwada hosts four ladies from Chikole and two from Kendur—one a graduate of the first HDTS. The HDTS *shramdam* produces a garden, foundation for Emerging Generation building and *bund* construction.

Internal: A collegium on the new form of management addresses ashram with thought of 2,500 villages next year.

Contradiction: Releasing new forms of water supply as wells go dry very early this year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Newly assigned strike force teams meet to plan four-week campaign in the six spotlight villages. Teams sent out and meet back on weekend to finalize timeline, bringing enthusiastic villagers with them to help in planning.

Internal: Nexus received the first contingent of Management Centrum into Bombay to prepare for audit.

Contradiction: Equipping the troops on the field to do effective and catalytic actuation, not just for one village but for the 232. (Wk. 5)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Electricity survey is completed and village is visited by Sub-Divisional Officer. Volunteer Health Agency is contacted for materials, two leaders' meetings are held and a visit is made to Meerut sugar refinery. Land is allocated for auxiliary House/community center. Twenty-five pages of English document are printed.

Internal: Two birthday parties are held and full auxiliary gathers in Sikror for the first Sunday celebration in the vilalge.

Contradiction: "Winging it" without assignments or structures of internal life after five weeks in residence. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Colleagues in Ranchi are revisited as part of continuing to build support and momentum for Area Calcutta buffer launching.

Internal: House regathers after Sikror HDP Consult in Area Delhi and funding and authorization treks in Bihar.

Contradiction: Finalizing details of company sponsorship. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Nexus and global team visit to Foreign Affairs Protocol Officer initiates formal top level process of legalization.

Internal: *Lion of Singapore*, musical play about Sir Stamford Raffles and the founding of modern Singapore, impacts House with timeliness of dealing with bureaucrats.

Contradiction: Lining up external clout in order to ensure a win on registration. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: House creates structure formats to do planning and implementing quickly.

Internal: Harry arrives, Mudj is sent out and Judy starts work.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive planning while moving 100,000 miles an hour. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Trying to get through the predominately Chinese streets is like trying to get through Times Square on New Year's Eve as the mood and festivities begin the Year of the Goat. Second term of preschool begins with three new teachers and more than 50 students. The Pasar purchases refrigerator (waiting for electrical hook-up) and kerosene franchise. First of two Mini-moks (jeeps) on loan from Fiatt-Allis is picked up. The Gabai Valley is beautiful green as rice planting is completed and villagers move onto next valley. Site visits include Johnson & Johnson, Veterinary Services, and Bonn representative for Freedom From Hunger. Five tons of cement are inkinded and M\$1,500 is deposited.

Internal: Visas for Yosts and Michaels are approved for one year.

Contradiction: Finding the ways to get formal recognition of Project with the state government when so much water is already over the dam. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Harry Wainwright from Wedge team arrives and makes a trip to Bandung to see governor. House decides to complete Kelapa Dua Project by July 1979. USAID proposal for Bontoa is approved, and Kelapa Dua USAID evaluation is completed. New bridge in Nurdin is repaired by villagers and more houses are springing up with two new ones in Asam. All preschool children's health is checked.

Internal: Wedge team and priors are trapped in Jakarta for four days by floods waiting to return to Kelapa Dua. Wedge team complains of no Iron Man in the collegium room, so three days later, intern, Fata walks in with a perfect wooden Iron Man.

Contradiction: Creating a five-month plan for completion. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Imaginal Education course for auxiliary and preschool teachers and English teachers is spirit event and results in preschool teachers being ready to build own curriculum. Bank personnel visits Bubun to examine collateral for second round of loans. Competition between two government lending agencies brings a tripling of the loan ceiling from one and six percent per year lower interest rate from the other. Village football field is exorcised for bad luck after a player breaks his toe—one begins to see football shoes now in Bubun. Fisheries Department makes initial fish pond survey, accompanied by Guardian USAID contract fisheries expert.

Internal: Denis Trager, wandering environmental scientist, comes to Bubun just in time to help build village space transformation scheme.

Contradiction: Discerning how to engage villagers in all programs while excitement from conversion of all village shops into cooperative buying groups has the heat of their passion. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: In the great week of preparing the ground, the economic survey is finished to prepare data for USAID proposal. The preschool parents' meeting reveals enthusiasm about further education for their children, which had been questioned. The ICA and Bontoa story and slides are shared at a meeting of the foreign funding agencies in South Sulawesi. LPPM, the nearby rice research institution blitzes the fertilizer demo plot donated by local farmer.

Internal: House tackles a self-support workshop and lays a plan, and closes the week with day of fasting.

Contradiction: Relating specific guild activities to total Project structures. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Record-breaking HK\$24,000 in-hand in one week, highest ever in Hong Kong, highlights week of Development band meeting preparation with two sent out to Brussels at the end of the week.

Internal: Spirited celebration Friday night sends out the Year of the Horse and anticipates the Year of the Ram.

Contradiction: Making the miracles happening every day common knowledge across the zone and the globe. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Elders Forum is held. Hong Kong International School participates on New Year's workday, painting signs, bathrooms, etc. Dental clinic materials are costed. Attendance at Amcham anniversary keeps up contact with business Guardians.

Internal: Sushila Joshi visits and teaches in Elders Forum.

Contradiction: Tying up economic aspects of Project before Chinese New Year deadline. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4-H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Over 100,000 pesos are deposited in one week, including large donation from San Miguel Foundation with their promise of imminent funding for the total cost of one village and the sending of a filming crew for before and after footage.

Internal: Thank-you luncheon is held for Japanese women who sent care shipment to Sudtonggan staff after fire.

Contradiction: Designing relevant structures for metamorphoses in midst of new universe. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Materials on the local economic vehicle and projection of enterprises over next three years in Hai Ou are prepared for consultation with Guardians on legal forms now needed in Taiwan to support the Project in the corporate economic development of the village.

Internal: Priors of Taipei and Kaohsiung (Hai Ou) Houses meet for corporate planning during Chinese Lunar New Year celebration.

Contradiction: Getting on the road to the 20 cities and counties while covering the Management and Development functions of the House. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Two Consults on same weekend stretches tent as "blue shirts" take on new roles as unit leaders/enablement guns and continue to be the mysterious blue troops who ride into town and help transform villages in three days. Four Consults are now completed, with 300 newly signed-on buri furniture workers, 400 newly enrolled pre-schoolers, 50 newly plowed hectares of corn, four kilometers of rock-lined roads, four 12 x 4 foot entrance signs, and one combined 125-page document in the printing.

Internal: ICA staff clothes given out as raffles during Christmas return after fire.

Contradiction: Locating more blue cloth. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New building for the general store goes up as store expands stock, making it the first place in Langub to have staples like rice and corn. Singer offers installments and discounts on sewing machines which would allow 15 women in the sewing industry to own their own machine in two years. Sewing building is also completed. Loan proposal is submitted to Development Bank of the Philippines for brick industry start-up capital, and Ben Potot begins training in technical process of brick making. Agriculture guild begins direct compost pits which catch on quickly. Over 100 turn out for community workday on road maintenance. Coke donates new signs for the programs. University of Mindano sends students to work in Langub and donates flowers, tins, paint and plywood for beautification.

Internal: Development team arrives as first guest in new guest room and gives exciting reports from Cebu.

Contradiction: Keeping up with the things that are moving faster than anticipated. (Wk. 7)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: First company volunteer hits the road to Chiba Prefecture with Mike Shaw. Yokohama circuit cements invitation to do two-day training with women leaders, including a TM. New workbook exceeds expectations and delights everyone.

Internal: Franciscans respond to a phone call with immediate loan of Y400,000 (\$2,000) towards deposit on the new House.

Contradiction: Hatching next of ten volunteer eggs. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: First TM of year is set up at Nap Eup by Mr. Kim, village leader, and held with 40 local residents attending. Kwangyung Il Ri finishes constructing kerosene station. Women's Association operates bathhouse and earns 10,000 won. Leadership begins plans for village assembly celebration.

Internal: New level of collegiality with sojourners is experienced through Bonhoeffer's Community ecclesiola study and sojourner's witness at Daily Office.

Contradiction: Knowing the mountain and having the tools, yet lacking the footholds to continue the climbing. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Five TMs are set up in Fukuoka-Ken with one more in the largest Shinto shrine in Western Japan, and two more possible. The Chu Goku Chi Ho Maneuver is launched in five prefectures in Western Japan. It will result in 15 additional TMs for the year and give momentum toward goal of 1,000 TMs in 1979-80 in Japan. Colleagues, Howard Stoner and Sushila Joshi, from Osaka, and Mr. Tonasaki from Oyubari staff arrive for the big maneuver.

Internal: After holding quarter's fast day, House casts out the demons in Japanese celebration of *Setsubon* and throws beans out the door.

Contradiction: Providing and maintaining maneuver backup systems and momentum for the first national maneuver in Japan. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A flood of introductions comes with offers to introduce House to key leaders in the *Chu Goku Chi Ho* ("China-side area" of Honshu), target of the February national TM maneuver. A visit in Wakayama sets up the first TM for the prefecture and yields introductions in the *Chu Goku Chi Ho*.

Internal: A Week II focus on Development produces a set of maneuvers for the next six months.

Contradiction: Seeing how every TM circuit breaks loose quick set-up. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Government plans for a new Oyubari downhill ski resort are made public. Article concerning TM is written for Hokkaido social education magazine.

Internal: House welcomes back Mrs. Sato and children as extended sojourners.

Contradiction: Sustaining a focused corporate thrust. (Wk. 7)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygandt family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Waitering and waitressing at Christmas dinner for family of Perth millionaire nets \$100 tip for sustenance coffers.

Internal: House sends Karen and John to Community Training Consultation in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Hanging ten while the external situation pushes House to hang fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: South Australian command post set up begins while four House troops plus a recent RS-I grad are sent to Victoria Golding Campaign.

Internal: House sends out Russell Brown and welcomes Dick Charles as sojourner.

Contradiction: Being intensely catalytic as the region gears up for 77 Community Meetings. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: CTC strike force of Barry Oakley and Terry Weygandt arrive to collect \$100 from state committee member and \$500 from Nabisco as the first of their annual gifts for 1979 and 1980. Transrational models for state campaigns are taking new forms.

Internal: Finance forms are brought up to date and ready for audit.

Contradiction: Forging regional models that will release Area Council consensus without pre-empting that consensus. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Planning for next six months' broad maneuvers goes on at Murrin Bridge, with Holcombes and Banks in 50° C (130°F) midsummer heat wave. Inkind continues and preparation are made for visit by Petersville to vegetable industry possibilities next week at Murrin Bridge.

Internal: Several hundred dollars are saved by doing valve grind at home on House car.

Contradiction: Getting House finances together prior to Area Council. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Whole House participates in Adelaide Area Council. First corporation check (\$250) for CMA arrives from Hastings Verring. Long weekend holiday enables House to set up for "Mango Tango" CMA maneuver.

Internal: House transforms nine rooms in "Path of Glory" blitz.

Contradiction: Connecting the vitality of the mission to colleagues' lives. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: First articles in sewing industry are manufactured and sold, while community person researches Sydney markets. New egg processor from community sells all eggs and new sales structure is created. Poultry produces more than 100 eggs per day. Dr. Lao film impacts community and costs are covered by sale of hard boiled eggs, oranges and sandwiches.

Internal: Midcourse corrections are made in light of January council, including new auxiliary configurations in run for first year completion celebration on March 31.

Contradiction: Re-creating community's self-story to sustain it through the next bold step of commitment to ongoing life engagement. (Wk. 7)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Focus on telling the story is manifest with weekly radio show, translated into *Something to Sing About: Marshall Islands*. Marshallese and TASC symbol on T-shirts for members and wholesale customers.

Internal: Global circuiting allows a family get-together in Guam, as Nan Bailey, on her way to India, meets Bill and Marianna, Suva Town Meeting team.

Contradiction: Allowing people to see beyond the strain of making a commitment in this place to what that means in relation to the world. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Full week of engagement includes visit from Bob Craig, the USAID representative, water flowing in pipes after four weeks of pressuring Public Works Department and crucial discussion of funding methods at reawakened guild meeting following a week of church celebration.

Internal: George Parker from Minneapolis adds to staff expertise in health services.

Contradiction: Moving through the desire to get things done to action from insight as defined by Dunne. (Wk. 7)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Life blossoms in metro cadres as Sacramento calls for the metro meeting—"We need to take responsibility for the mission here".

Internal: Joseph Iida visits on his return from Jamaica and reports on the WCC Central Committee during ecclesiola with seven colleagues at the table.

Contradiction: Creating the weekly implementation model which enables the large jigsaw puzzle to be built step-by-step. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Doing the preparation which ensures rapid catalytic set-up. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House completes Deming maneuver with 10 TMs in Southwest New Mexico. Roman Catholic Bishop Flores' diocese of El Paso is visited and will support TM in his parishes.

Internal: House sends the Filipski family to Richgrove HDP.

Contradiction: Reorganizing maneuvers around smaller House staff. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Health classes are set, including first aid class and diet club. Health office is now functioning. First Pisinemo resident orchestrates at TM in New Mexico.

Internal: Return of hunting party (with one javelina) and send out of two college sojourners brings 26 to pizza dinner.

Contradiction: Moving excited friends and colleagues beyond interest to actual participation in the Project. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: CYF funding intensifies with meetings with two state agencies: Community Education and Social Rehabilitation services.

Internal: In midst of job interviews, House discovers Billings is headquarters of a major US industry: KOA (Kampgrounds of America).

Contradiction: Holding to the missional priorities while not letting day to day get in the way. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Trip to Fargo secures a commitment for a new foam-constructed facility for day care by Quarter 1. Cannon Ball Industries launches mass production painting process and sends Trash Barro plans to Murrin Bridge HDP.

Internal: Workday that leaves the back room and entry immaculate is celebrated by Malaysian feast prepared by Jelawai Ambas as she gets sent out to the HDTS.

Contradiction: Creating a screen to overlay on 1001 good ideas. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Colleagues gun and host global overview event with the Panchayat as 25 colleagues hear stories of the world from Widen to Kuh Duh E Ri to Sevagram. New typewriter arrives after colleague gives House a \$500 check, saying he will collect from other colleagues. The same colleague gives a weekend trip to Cusick for a small business PSU, taking four others with him.

Internal: "Whirling Dervish" dynamic prevails as entire House gets "spit and polish" in preparation for Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Reaping the fruits of seeds sown by Panchayat visit. (Wk. 7)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Preparing the financial statement and annual report for ICA annual meeting initiates Houses's two-week Public Accountability Maneuver.

Internal: House celebrates twice in one day: with community at Homecoming and with Christina Slicker for her birthday.

Contradiction: Designing the pressure defense to make sure troops are in winning position. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Beautiful stake sign is put in Stake 4. Garden and another welcome sign are ready for placement. UTSA professor helps plan for comprehensive survey. Twentieth TM is held, completing one in every town in tri-micro.

Internal: Bob and Francis Schlesinger visit Asherton.

Contradiction: Meeting deadlines while creating the miraculous. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House initiates beginning of three metro cadres through an engagement maneuver with weekly phone calls in keeping touch with over 100 people on a monthly basis. This is flanked by the first mailing of the monthly regional newsletter and planning of cadre constructs.

Internal: House posts a maneuver chart holding the seven arenas of work through June, in addition to regional maneuvers.

Contradiction: Dancing through creating the new phase of awakening which is experienced as stripping the gears. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House makes presentation to Highland Park UMC Community Outreach Committee for financial support of global social demonstration. Meeting with director of the Goals for Dallas Alliance, Chamber of Commerce and the Women's Center begin to frame Dallas cluster for June.

Internal: The seminary study pushes the 11 colleagues of the ecclesiola covenant group into depth dialogue with the world.

Contradiction: Setting up four saturation maneuvers catalytically. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Guild meeting of 21 declares Delta Pace's original two-year vision substantially done, and plans February 24 TM to celebrate victory and look at a Consult for the next two-year plan, possible expansion and ICA role. TM report to the Governor's staff solidifies support in that office, and a TM presentation as part of the orientation for new statewide VISTA volunteers strengthens ties to that agency (Pace has five local VISTA volunteers at that session who will be doing TMs). Mayor and three aldermen go to Atlanta for presentation to Federal Regulations Council. Contradiction: Capping and naming the victory so that momentum can be passed on to the new maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Three campaigns spin together producing a local Nanaimo frame, \$1300 in-hand for Development and intensified engagement through North Vancouver slide show—one to Guardians meeting and one consultant to Minto.

Internal: House welcomes Yvonne Meyers (back from Australia) and Tickner family to House Church.

Contradiction: Utilizing regional resources to increase the momentum of Development and saturation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Important authorization appointments are set in Fairbanks, and four more consultants with dollars committed are added to Minto Consult list. Excited public relations officer at Wien Airlines says yes to large in-kind order. Bensons decide to be Anchorage stronghold when House moves to Minto village.

Internal: House remaneuvers for the final four weeks prior to total House relocation to Minto.

Contradiction: Creating eventfulness in midst of day by day, nitty-gritty Consult preparation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Planning meeting with Reverend Bill Wall opens doors to targeted local community. Saturday evening guest night features slide show and great discussion on human rights.

Internal: Two new permeation jobs begin and one temporary job concludes.

Contradiction: Releasing the multiple options and building the symbolic victory. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Teams in Winnipeg track down \$3,300 and have key authorization visit. In Vogar, high school students help create summer employment proposal, while land use plan becomes focus of stake visits.

Internal: Keystone collegium reveals new thrust in social trek.

Contradiction: Creating momentum relative to men's employment proposals. (Wk. 7)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Framing and set up in four neighborhoods in Houston break loose, five TMs scheduled and TM training of 13 in preparation for second TM in Riverside.

Internal: Nancy Graves and Luigi Perschetti return home just as Western Front people arrive, making House bustle with activity.

Contradiction: Framing the action of Houston pivot plans and Houston Hustle Maneuver to allow one thrust to go forward. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: The Voice is distributed to the whole community for communication of the public hearing Thursday night for the HUD grant (CDBG).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mississippi 200 reports lots of awakenment is going on in that state. Memphis region inkinds printing and sends out 100 formal invitations for the global slide show and Evening at the Institute, and colleague night—all in one—to friends, Guardians and Development contacts.

Internal: Job hunting continues, enabled by *How to Get a High-Paying Job* study and Thursday ecclesiola during collegium.

Contradiction: Remembering the global strategy when the parochial insists on consuming your being. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First Town Meeting training event is held to reinforce a series of scheduled neighborhood TMs. HUD visits to view proposed plan to work in local neighborhood.

Internal: House receives a visitor from Switzerland for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Forcing momentum to elicit glue in an urban stronghold. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Decision to hold authorization event accelerates finishing touches to front rooms of community center.

Internal: VISTA supervisors' grant breaks open two past House checks and puts self-support within realistic reach.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensiveness in the midst of community focusing on school redistricting. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The House visits colleagues Ron and Sue Nixon in West Palm Beach. Late night conversation and next day planning clarify plans for future stronghold there. Ecclesiola format is utilized for youth sponsors from the church who meet for the first time at the House. A community development official gets excited about using Town Meetings in Orlando.

Internal: The last items from storage are moved to the newly-rented House and a search for other furniture begins.

Contradiction: Holding the long range vision while moving the immediate mountain. (Wk. 6)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: LENS set up is done with Georgia Pacific, Seattle First National, Department of Transportation and Pioneer National Bank in Seattle. The next six months of the *Journal* are made print-ready. Rotary International invites the ICA to prepare an article on Rotarian participation in HDPs and TMs. Four hundred tickets are sold for the Uptown 5 Valentine Ball.

Internal: Three are sent out on the Management Centrum internal audit trek to each nexus and band meeting in Brussels.

Contradiction: Planning the agonizing, practical details which give substance to doing. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: The Iron Man is back up on the Plaza. Chicago Plan on Fifth City is finished and submitted to Economic Development Commission.

Internal: HDS hosts Fifth Citizens and House auxiliary at Saturday night party.

Contradiction: Blending curriculum of HDS into FHDP as one thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Community assembly finally happens after being postponed by one snowstorm and threatened by another. Preschool opens with fourteen. Every household income

survey is completed for community HUD block grant application.

Internal: Regional workday transforms collegium room, Emerging Generation room, and kitchen.

Contradiction: Creating a focus for each guild in the midst of many possibilities. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: House and Panchayat participate in a key authorization luncheon for the business community. House receives positive reception in Nebraska to TM when contacted for first time since last spring. A dozen colleagues stay after House Church to participate in building a regional Academy recruitment plan.

Internal: The Panchayat's visit includes fantastic Movement dinner, a restful House excursion and two authorization luncheons.

Contradiction: Unblocking "he is the only one who can do" syndrome. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Ten events are held in the Eau Claire area to complete the third regional stronghold. The participants of the city-wide assembly engage seriously in the task of defining, on behalf of the city's grassroots, the implications for action for the future.

Internal: Over thirty metro colleagues enable and cater three international benefit buffets with over 20 dishes from around the world, Claire Clements' Indian dancing and the global film.

Contradiction: Defining structures of immediate and concrete engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Multiple visits result in multiple events in towns over 800.

Internal: House functions in spite of sole occupant's broken ankle.

Contradiction: Getting all events set in limited time to avoid protracted campaign. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Disco dance draws 200 people to Mill Shoals and nets \$200 for youth service force. Community meeting planned agenda is set aside to make intensive corporate effort to attain sewer system.

Internal: Phase III of stronghold reveals that writing and phoning soften people up but attending a village board meeting with a slide show turns people onto committing themselves to a TM.

Contradiction: Enabling community to maintain its decision to win on sewer, industry, signs and strongholds. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Winter Frolic meeting attendance jumps to 14, as caps and buttons are ordered, activities planned, timeline consensus reached, and everyone is involved.

Internal: Whole House journeys to Minneapolis for all or part of the week in great "\$5440 or Fight" blitz to erase Kinney deficit with antiques, labor pool jobs, bazaar, dinner and even blood!

Contradiction: Turning the Winter Frolic into a key push on visibility, stakes, guilds, etc. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: House hears live reports from Guatemala and Egypt as Wisconsin colleagues return from Projects. House completes quarter of continuing consultation with Rock County CAP after LENS.

Internal: Sojourners again enhance House life and food, celebrating Chinese New Year with Japanese feast.

Contradiction: Choosing the geography with the greatest potential. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: After hosting TM assembly, Tippecanoe Valley High School has TMs for three classes of senior government students who write six serious proposals and one hilarious song. John Webster does slide show for International Agriculture Department at Purdue University. House attends Churchmen United annual retreat, showing global slides and the fabulous Lorimor "before and after" show.

Internal: David Lazear works with House to build multifaceted Academy recruitment maneuver and shares work of Research Centrum.

Contradiction: Forcing time to break open new ground when the on-going tasks take it all. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Urban planner of Covington, Kentucky, credits TM for catalyzing resurgence of city pride, neighborhood organization development, and visible transformation of residential and commercial areas.

Internal: House decor blitz creates new office look and two traveling decor boxes for circuiters.

Contradiction: Building new strategies instead of patching up holes in old ones. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Circuits reveal colleagues from TMs ready to do more in three new strongholds.

Internal: Research Centrum: Academy visits for days of planning actuation, giving House a focus around which to do several third campaign tactics.

Contradiction: Establishing image of regular circuit presence. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Ten metro colleagues plan for Quarter III Metro Council with House, and decide that the morning reporting session will write and publish a newsletter with features on Quarter II accomplishments.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 50 attending is highlighted by TM and GSD game, including three moves ahead for proper framing and two moves back for funding proposal failure.

Contradiction: Getting the three-year stronghold timeline, which is in everyone's mind, onto the wall. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: House enables Long Island core meeting for saturation events in Smithtown.

Internal: Joan Seacord is sent out on Panchayat visitation.

Contradiction: Focusing death ground in the midst of many demands. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House contacts 1,500 friends of Movement, the first time of caring for that many in the region.

Internal: House experiences total corporate expenditure, putting finishing touches on mailing in wee hours.

Contradiction: Channeling the momentum of Development and newsletter to overcome inertia of saturation. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Call to secure authorization for TMs in the Western Finger Lakes yields a complete frame of whole tri-micro. February newsletter goes to press.

Internal: Preparation for Development intensification week focuses House's efforts on one common task.

Contradiction: Finding the prospects for productive Development calls instead of just having exciting visits. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Ivy City continues search into Ivy City's history with interviews with elders which uncover wealth of sources at Gallaudet College such as correspondence from the President of the college describing the booming community surrounding the college. Also uncovered is a former resident, later Assistant Police Chief, who wrote book on growing up in Ivy City.

Internal: House hosts Huang Hsin Peng in the midst of snow and cold.

Contradiction: Assigning tactics and implementaries to the maneuver arenas. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: House signs a contract with CETA for \$42,919 to provide jobs for local youth and self-support. Reporter from state's largest newspaper comes to take color photos and writes fine article on front page of second section.

Internal: Auxiliary moves to two-story house which is renovated by Youth on two days off of school because of snow.

Contradiction: Getting action focused on the long-range mission while snow, wind and cold draw attention to the immediate. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Penn State Extension for Youth targets end of March for a demonstration CYF to involve adult and teen leaders from 200 4-H groups in the county who could then choose to set up a CYF in their own neighborhood.

Internal: New follow-up data from a South Philadelphia community excites the House and sparks up the newest newsletter.

Contradiction: Bracketing urgent stronghold and framing implementaries in order to bring off the Development intensification week. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: First of a series of Sunday morning priorship training sessions draws New Jersey colleagues and House members for imaginal education and charting of Rollo May's paper.

Internal: Collegiums on urs provides insight into contentless Word and grounds gifts and perversions of white ur.

Contradiction: Focusing death ground in the midst of many demands. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Preschoolers' parents meet as interim board to pursue license and funding and propose starting immediately the Little Peeps Playgroup of Chicken Street. Winter Carnival Committee launches plans for Starks' 184th birthday celebration.

Internal: Two Project local leaders attend House Church for the first time.

Contradiction: Coordinating time, priorities and people in front of numerous challenges. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: The Development planning workshop provides an avenue for wider involvement by colleagues and creates new enthusiasm. An updated mailing list is completed and typed onto address labels. Every day of next week has an appointment for GCF scheduled.

Internal: Ecclesiola college and seminary allow for a serious exchange of opinions, and sodality is fun.

Contradiction: Maintaining organization and discipline to make sure that interest and enthusiasm result in programs and money. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Southern Tier Energy Enterprise Development small loan program, a program of the eight-state Appalachian Regional Commission, indicates interest in a substantial low-interest loan for start up money for Charlotte Valley Firewood Company, if bank participation can be secured. Project core decides to buy land option on 10-acre plot as CVF site, first concrete financial transaction to launch the firewood company. Glens Falls "citizens in support of Town Meeting" and Development preparation indicate ball is rolling on saturation maneuvers.

Internal: House has a great collegium on ten considerations in community reformulation.

Contradiction: Creating corporate eventfulness to sustain Project momentum and motivation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two strongholds are launched with first forum held in Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, led by local trained workshop leaders. Three newspapers give press coverage and state Representative is present. Forum produces a six-month timeline for actuation of proposals.

Internal: Study of the *Alternatives* gives a surprising overview and pull-together of news events over the past ten years.

Contradiction: Wanting to focus on one arena of activity for sake of emphasis. (Wk. 7)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: House discovers appropriate timing of GWF as inquiries come in, many colleagues get caught up in swirl and maneuver for funding and catalytic recruitment takes shape.

Internal: Collegiums, mailings and calls push corporate story and keys to communicating it.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate stance in midst of individual assignments. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: First Night at Institute with the showing of the band of 24 slides elicits the decision of a young teacher (result of ad in newspaper) to spend some time in an overseas HDP. An old-time colleague will set up two CYFs in her school. Initial extensive research on saturation is done in the London Region.

Internal: Self support victory is won.

Contradiction: Making single events part of the web of the missional work. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sudbury City seems ripe for a saturation stronghold as North Leeds county chugs along. Both events will be funded by the provincial lottery at \$8,000 each. Development stays for a day to write up the northern Ontario HDP site selection and Consult proposal.

Internal: Sojourners, Robert Lapp and Nigel Weir, have a great time being on the road and participating in symbolic life, neither having any previous contact.

Contradiction: Staging the impact events for saturation major road blocks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: In the midst of working encounters with forty community people this week, the confidence of Lorne is revealed: rughookers create new designs and prototypes for Atlantic Trade Fair, LEDC management begins office remodeling, volunteer fire chief meets with municipal affairs officer, who decides to pay \$500 of 1978 payables for firehall.

Internal: The maneuver for individual nurture through small dinner parties with the leadership is great collegial event with two families to dinner and games Wednesday night.

Contradiction: Ensuring Project programs receive immediate funding and creating maneuver that wins three jobs in next two weeks. (Wk. 6)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: *Foro* (TM) state caravans are launched Monday and in first week one *Foro* is done and two set. Community youth have a day at the beach.

Internal: House's storeroom jungle is reclaimed.

Contradiction: Keeping news conversation alive when ionosphere blocks shortwave. (Wk. 7)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: A villager takes charge of the preschool due to program shifts for the summer, 25 women meet to plan a women's event, and farmers write an installment plan to pay old electricity bills for their well.

Internal: Helen Haug announces decision to intern.

Contradiction: Keeping a newly launched ship afloat while finishing the hull. (Wk. 5)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: The Bananeiras summer school program opens its doors in the freshly painted, newly acquired community center with over 40 Phase I participating all day. The program begins with a CYF held in torrential rains with 30 present. The bakery oven arrives with great fanfare and the bakery opens, serving cake and bread to those present. A dog vaccinating team rounds up all the dogs in the plaza and vaccinates over 50 of the village dogs in the rain! A public health nurse from Rio Bonito gives Saturday first aid classes to the stake health caretakers and other interested women and teaches injection procedures.

Internal: Panchayat arrives, breaking loose reflective brooding on continental strategies in the midst of local swirl of activities.

Contradiction: Engaging awakened men in concrete economic development. (Wk. 7)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Space transformations abound as demonstration garden is replanted, tool pool shed construction begins, and stakes do workshop on town master plan. Baptists are added to ITI host committee as impact team makes first island circuit for ITI.

Internal: Eating and selling first batch of self-support chickens, House hosts J.S. Dethe from India and Amos Grundahl, Wisconsin farmer, experiencing all systems go with four on the road.

Contradiction: Broadening and deepening stake meeting participation as launching pad for final dash to finish line. (Wk. 7)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: An exciting week of preparing for electricity includes training residents to install wires and boxes and planning a celebration to begin a new era with total dedication.

Internal: The auxiliary, after a workday side-by-side with community people, pulls together to plan its life as a corporate team for the next week, and finds new colleaguehood in the process.

Contradiction: Enabling a celebration that will turn a whole community towards the future, not just turn on lights. (Wk. 7)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a \$30,000 check arrives from Sisters of Charity of Tilburg during the band meeting in Brussels. Canada does it again with \$10,000 in-hand from McLean Foundation. Church in Europe (bishops, orders, local congregations) begins to fund and frame campaigns, and local church in Elba, New York, responds to a phone call about Cebu House fire and sends check for \$595. Interchange mailgram arrives in Chicago from Brussels as band maneuvers get underway and Chicago Nexus Eastern Front team lines up New York "Park Avenue Parade" with 11 appointments with multi-national corporations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of old images of the task limiting vision of how to use troops, as new arenas of engagement burst open.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the second session of the eighth grade Phase I RS-I. David McClesky spins with centrum on John Dunne and the creation of two and a half hour mini-retreat for 1,100 clergymen. Australian CTC produces ten-day auxiliary training construct for use in Projects. The recovery and inclusive context begins to inform the doing of total mission: empowering research. The key contradiction lies in the arena of inadequate means for this global group to think as one on the radical new being faced.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the fifth annual Uptown Valentine Ball is smashing success with estimated 2300 in attendance and many notable guests, including the mayor's wife. Representatives from Operations Centrum: Chicago and Singapore work on impact in the Philippines, reporting frame set for pivotal city in Manila and three-pronged saturation campaign begun, targeting 648 events in Manila, Davao and Cebu. The global band meeting is scheduled for Week 8 at the Brussels Nexus. The key contradiction lies in the arena of continuing to struggle with the face of the Third Campaign as preparation is begun for Global Guardian Consult.

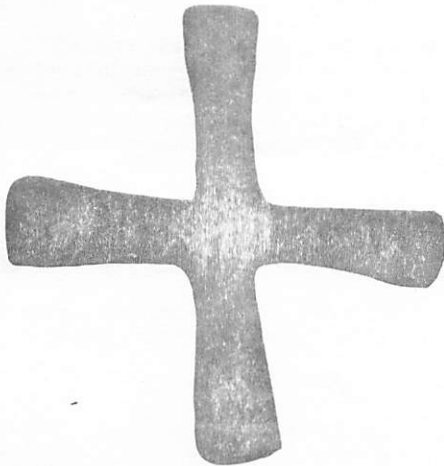
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports the victories for the week consist of completing the printing for the next six months of *The Journal*, establishing the demonstration community kitchen at Chicago Nexus, doing four internal audits at each Nexus, and the painting and setting up of the janitor's closets enabling stake care of the residential floors of the Chicago Nexus. Following in the tradition of Christmas caroling, Management Centrum serenades Chicago Nexus with love songs on Valentine's Day. The breakthrough of the week comes in the form of role playing the audit at a centrum dinner, giving other posts a sense of the activity of fiscal services. The key contradiction lies in the arena of reconfiguring troops over against the increased demand for materials and financial services and the contingencies of the weather conditions.

External: Local delegates to Termine Europe Projects meeting report on event being great celebration with House. Major highlight is closing address in three languages. Visit to Intermediate Technology Industrial Services (ITIS) reveals great potential resource for HDPs around the globe for technical assistance in developing local industry.

Internal: Sr. Joyce Blackwell, Sacred Heart sister who met us first in Cano Negro, visits House and expresses serious interest in using methods in local community and with her Order.

Contradiction: Concentrating on finding the open doors instead of beating heads against the brick walls. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Circuit sets up TMs and CYFs in the Aberdeen Metro. Network catalysis begins across the North with new breakthroughs in the Glasgow area as car gives greater maneuverability.

Internal: Edinburgh House Church hosts five guests in first mobile common meal maneuver.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on anticipated regional victories to mobilize the next metro phase. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'R GWAITH HDP

External: Development gets a shot in the arm with intensive visiting producing £29 in-hand, £820 working, two strong Guardian possibilities, and the Tai'r gwaith Welfare setting plans to sell £875 worth of tickets to a concert on behalf of an adopted village. Representatives from European Project meeting return excited and tired and compose 3,000 word report.

Internal: House celebrates record month for earned income—133 percent over monthly budget.

Contradiction: Inventing a new style of cricket—bowling to two batsmen at the same time, both immediate visibility and solid leadership training for continuity. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two GCFs at Vanves, where the House is located and at Merobert in the Evry Polis, complete one-half of the urban Paris Metros with 15% of the population of Merobert participating: 40 people.

Internal: House sends out two members, Monique Le Guillou, French, and Ekkerhard Von Weiher, German, to Week 6 Belgian Wallonia stronghold maneuver.

Contradiction: Launching a maneuver advance for the remaining quarter while being absorbed by immediate maneuvers. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Bureaucracy is put in motion to allow repairs, electricity and water into the new industrial building. "Feet on the table" session breaks loose new images for the next two weeks, focusing on the visible sign of the industrial building in operation.

Internal: House sends out the remaining guests from the European Project meeting, and does major housecleaning.

Contradiction: Following up on all the possibilities without losing the major focus. (Wk. 7)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: The great week of launching agriculture begins with delivery of 1,000 naira (\$1,500 US) worth of chicken feed, followed by delivery of 1,200 chicks by Agric, the Ministry of Agriculture, which catalyzes an impromptu chicken house built by Achaji Salu. The Manpower Administration Manager of Pioneer Metal Company visits to inspect the partially completed new poultry building in preparation for granting in kind request for roofing. Co-op stores and Kingsway stores request sewing industry samples, while the Ministry of Trade and Co-operatives enlists 38 founding members of the Ijede Co-Op. On the weekend, a fifty-woman GWF is held in Lagos at St. Paul's Church, while new CYF orchestrators, Jago and Coleman, pull off three events.

Internal: First of injection of new troops from Kenya, Peter Malaba, arrives and catalyzes demonstration auxiliary garden.

Contradiction: Initiating economic programs in midst of fear and uncertainty. (Wk. 7)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Hosting the Development band meetings spins global missional images for entire Nexus.

Internal: Collegium on Dunne grounds the climb up the mountain and draws responses relative to centrum participation and individual care.

Contradiction: Creating cross-centrum information vehicle for every centrum's data and wisdom. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House finishes Wallonia maneuver with new advantages for next round of polis coverage as team from France moves in, enables the win and leaves.

Internal: Late night celebration for House caps off great week for Brussels and Paris circuiters.

Contradiction: Adjusting a maneuver intended to be replicable. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House receives request to do a demonstration of the Dorpsdag for an all-day gathering of the *Welzijns Ambtenaren van Kleine Germeenten: Overijssel*, or all the official "village well-being" people from the small groups of villages in the Province of Overijssel. House will finish polis coverage in that province by then, marking the first solid groundwork on network authorization for strongholds next year. Road troops spend the week in Brussels, working on an area stronghold task force and enjoying the edges of the Development band meeting. With addition of one more from Amsterdam and two from Paris, the House has eight troops for the weekend. House sets up three TMs and does workshop leadership training all in one day, with a fine celebrative, reflective meal at the end.

Internal: Meeting with George Boskase, key Roman Catholic lay colleague, yields first promising inroad into the Catholic church in the Netherlands, particularly in reference to the possibility of a new facility.

Contradiction: Honoring a town's local situation, milieu, and timelines while challenging them by honoring House's timeline. (Wk. 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Elizabeth, Manfred and Berthold teach German RS-I to TM participants and Kreuzberg Ost volunteers. Reflection emphasizes its formulation power and this gets dramatized by

(nearly) unsolicited contributions. Government volunteer agency approves four ICA projects (Kreuzberg Ost, Tai'rgwaith, Termine and Kawangware) for work camps in August with funded pre-training in Frankfurt.

Internal: Bob Rank comes back in town to assist House in making its Development bottom line for the third consecutive month.

Contradiction: Keeping polis coverage as number one priority when Movement building demonstrates its jealousy. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: House holds RS-I with three community members. First finance task force meeting is held. Guardians meeting on housing is held. Two broken presses call forth hidden talents in printing and press repair as they are involved in getting them both rolling again.

Internal: Suspense mounts as city inspectors come to determine if House is being charged illegally high rent, while workmen come to install showers in the kitchen so house owner can raise rents.

Contradiction: Broadening vision of missional engagement to unblock turnover of community participation. (Wk. 8)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: "Rise-Up Africa" is the spirit of the Bi-Continental Council attended by all Area Kinshasa staff in Nairobi. Kapini village leadership assume total responsibility for running the Project as 15 auxiliary leave for the Tamzam train ride to the council. On return, Area Council draws in long-time grads to Kapini for work on the three campaigns.

Internal: Meg Wildhack reaches Kapini, finally, a welcome return since her work as educator during the Kapini Consult.

Contradiction: Re-creating comprehensive Project picture in midst of community move to become engulfed in particular programs that are high-security, low-risk. (Wk. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Pipes connecting water tank to well are in place after marathon work day. All stakes initiate work and timelines for toilet and showers.

Internal: Margreet Farid is sent out to Europe and Phil Kneisley arrives to "green" the desert.

Contradiction: Training the leadership for now, while preparing them for the world's accountability. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: In kind two-wheel tractor demonstrates capability in plowing one and a half acres in two days. First litter of pigs is taken to market. Volunteers offer to write proposal for \$10,000 (US) to build health outpost and staff the facility. Saturation team returns with great report of doing 20 Village Meetings and three assemblies in two weeks reaching 6,000 people, and is requested to return for more events. Three LENS seminars are firmed up; three others in process. Program leaders join staff in preparing economic expansion plan for A.T. International grant and loan.

Internal: Fantastic report of saturation team during collegium impacts House with power of awakening campaign, ability to "live off the land", and new level of cooperation with government officials.

Contradiction: Establishing solid structures that will undergird the future of the Project and the community of Kawangware. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Maliwada leadership generates economic ventures—a new brick factory and a *huann* shop (food store), which keeps adding items to its stock. The preschool is reactivated and many children are participating. As one of six spotlights for January, Maliwada hosts four ladies from Chikole and two from Kendur—one a graduate of the first HDTs. The HDTs *shramdam* produces a garden, foundation for Emerging Generation building and *bund* construction.

Internal: A collegium on the new form of management addresses ashram with thought of 2,500 villages next year.

Contradiction: Releasing new forms of water supply as wells go dry very early this year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Newly assigned strike force teams meet to plan four-week campaign in the six spotlight villages. Teams sent out and meet back on weekend to finalize timeline, bringing enthusiastic villagers with them to help in planning.

Internal: Nexus received the first contingent of Management Centrum into Bombay to prepare for audit.

Contradiction: Equipping the troops on the field to do effective and catalytic actuation, not just for one village but for the 232. (Wk. 5)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Entrance signs and House name plates are mounted. Internal roads are leveled and Agricultural Development Officer takes registrations of farmers for expanded dairy industry, new poultry farms and piggeries.

Internal: House celebrates the birth of a daughter to Jaya and Marcus Salve.

Contradiction: Maintaining daily programs and regular events in the face of continuous special activities. (Wk. 8)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for

harigans. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Colleagues in Ranchi are revisited as part of continuing to build support and momentum for Area Calcutta buffer launching.

Internal: House regathers after Sikror HDP Consult in Area Delhi and funding and authorization treks in Bihar.

Contradiction: Finalizing details of company sponsorship. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Nexus completes brief with wisdom of advocate who is chartered accountant as to procedure of legal base. *Chingay*, Chinese New Year, celebration procession, along with invitation to celebrate at Singaporean colleague's home impacts House with multi-traditional cultural gifts.

Internal: Rebstock family is sent out to San Francisco to enable Singapore Nexus self-support.

Contradiction: Forging new image of appropriate service in the nation. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: House creates structure formats to do planning and implementing quickly.

Internal: Harry arrives, Mudj is sent out and Judy starts work.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive planning while moving 100,000 miles an hour. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUĀLA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Community experiences great sense of activity as long-awaited construction begins on the Mara Bamboo Industrial Complex with local labor and leadership of 20 working every day. Projected completion is one month. Workday begins promptly at 8:00 when one man from each household marches down the road with a tool over his shoulder to begin clearing the mountain stream water system of leaves and to repair the dam. ICA beautification demonstration efforts create mud-proof pathways. Site visits include Kuala Lumpur Chamber of Commerce representative and London Assurance. In support of Projects, Barclay's requests House send proposal to London.

Internal: House joins with the Yost family in celebrating 33 years of marriage.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum during days of waiting for affirmative response from District Officer, feeling of suspended animation. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village methods training module has 34 villagers and ten auxiliary to nine sessions over four days. Guild formation and timeline of quarter priorities are broken loose by Week 5 consensus assembly.

Internal: House enjoys discontinuous boat trip to Melaka Straits Island.

Contradiction: Organizing auxiliary to follow up village priorities as well as possible fallout from government LENS and one University Forum. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: In the great week of preparing the ground, the economic survey is finished to prepare data for USAID proposal. The preschool parents' meeting reveals enthusiasm about further education for their children, which had been questioned. The ICA and Bontoa story and slides are shared at a meeting of the foreign funding agencies in South Sulawesi. LPPM, the nearby rice research institution blitzes the fertilizer demo plot donated by local farmer.

Internal: House tackles a self-support workshop and lays a plan, and closes the week with day of fasting.

Contradiction: Relating specific guild activities to total Project structures. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Function as Wayside Inn is highlighted as Nexus hosts Nan Bailey on her way to India via Guam, the Rebstock family enroute to the States, and Mary Kaye Heisler reporting back from a trip to Sudtonggan Consults.

Internal: A week of celebration begins with the Chinese New Year and a Nexus celebrational dinner at a Malaysian restaurant, including a "Ladies Lunch Out" and a feast with the Rebstocks.

Contradiction: Discerning the real and timely contradictions in the midst of the many issues and not-yet-ripe contradictions. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: House picks up HK\$20,000 check for Nam Wai dental clinic. Four more village women turn up for antique fashion belt sewing industry. Village youth send newsletter to surrounding villages.

Internal: House sends out one-month Chinese sojourner to India.

Contradiction: Making moves over the abyss in midst of lack of data on dental clinic and land development. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guard says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: First GCF training session is held with YMCA staff to do 60 TMs throughout Philippines. Electrification of second Project is accomplished through inkind of two kilometers of wire. House receives order for Sudtonggan craft from largest Philippine exporter.

Internal: New Year brings expanded English teaching schedule as House makes self-support for the month.

Contradiction: Obtaining water for Langub. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Materials on the local economic vehicle and projection of enterprises over next three years in Hai Ou are prepared for consultation with Guardians on legal forms now needed in Taiwan to support the Project in the corporate economic development of the village.

Internal: Priors of Taipei and Kaohsiung (Hai Ou) Houses meet for corporate planning during Chinese Lunar New Year celebration.

Contradiction: Getting on the road to the 20 cities and counties while covering the Management and Development functions of the House. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: House sends out an army to the front with all in battle position within one hour in five locations. At the same time, four support teams are launched—health, preschool, utilities, industry—each to be in one village each week. Each performs miracles, i.e., 450 enrolled in four new preschools, possibility of immediate employment of 1,000 women, electricity within two weeks in one village. At same time, operations band is activated with the total funding of the Mactan 216 GCF Maneuver in March, and the completion of the 648 GCF design for the Philippines to be completed by July.

Internal: First week of House in five locations finds each one doing common ecclesiola (called Roundtable).

Contradiction: Creating comprehensive decor that holds focus and releases expenditure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New building for the general store goes up as store expands stock, making it the first place in Langub to have staples like rice and corn. Singer offers installments and discounts on sewing machines which would allow 15 women in the sewing industry to own their own machine in two years. Sewing building is also completed. Loan proposal is submitted to Development Bank of the Philippines for brick industry start-up capital, and Ben Potot begins training in technical process of brick making. Agriculture guild begins direct compost pits which catch on quickly. Over 100 turn out for community workday on road maintenance. Coke donates new signs for the programs. University of Mindano sends students to work in Langub and donates flowers, tins, paint and plywood for beautification.

Internal: Development team arrives as first guest in new guest room and gives exciting reports from Cebu.

Contradiction: Keeping up with the things that are moving faster than anticipated. (Wk. 7)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Development leaps into a new orbit with TM sponsorship package. Monthly Guardians dinner at the House has 12 around the table with every Guardian volunteering for particular assignments. Visit to Village and Town Mayors' Association opens access to 2,600 mayors in Japan's smaller communities.

Internal: Masayo Koshiyama moves in, and Hiroshi Fukuyama arrives from Oyubari for ten days of Development and framing work.

Contradiction: Turning enormous advantages into visible victories. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Preschool re-opens after winter holiday with curriculum planned to ready kindergarten children to enter first grade in March. Village leadership firms plans for assembly and sets February 8 as annual "prayer" date.

Internal: RS-I weekend with nine sojourners and six auxiliary grounds in Christian symbols.

Contradiction: Discerning the rhythm and flow of events in the village to be able to effectively catalyze globality. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Five TMs are set up in Fukuoka-Ken with one more in the largest Shinto shrine in Western Japan, and two more possible. The Chu Goku Chi Ho Maneuver is launched in five prefectures in Western Japan. It will result in 15 additional TMs for the year and give momentum toward goal of 1,000 TMs in 1979-80 in Japan. Colleagues, Howard Stoner and Sushila Joshi, from Osaka, and Mr. Tonasaki from Oyubari staff arrive for the big maneuver.

Internal: After holding quarter's fast day, House casts out the demons in Japanese celebration of *Setsubon* and throws beans out the door.

Contradiction: Providing and maintaining maneuver backup systems and momentum for the first national maneuver in Japan. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: The Chu Goku Chi Ho TM National Maneuver keeps two on the road as part of three teams and brings an enthusiastic support from regional colleagues "at home" through introductions and funding. Newsletter (grass roots Development) and women's event invitations are sent out in record time with the help of the new inkind TANAC addressing machine and many local women who write all the addresses in Japanese on the coding cards.

Internal: Neighborhood care addresses House with gifts of oranges, strawberries, meat, juice and circus tickets for the children as well as someone to take the children to the circus.

Contradiction: Deciding that in the midst of the ambiguous there's no clear-cut decision, but that the decision is the necessary act. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: The House hosts Community Youth Forum of 18 for 24-hour program with college students who wrestle seriously with vocational question. Rotary speaking engagement in Sapporo gives new credibility to work with important Guardians.

Internal: House sends out Mr. Tonasaki as new intern of the Order to the Tokyo House and welcomes Miss Okuda for a month-long sojourn.

Contradiction: Pushing winter activities in Oyubari. (Wk. 8)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The week is spent on an area management PSU in action as bills are paid and creditors visited.

Internal: Permanent job is secured by Pat Weygandt in the same office as Jane Miller.

Contradiction: Building momentum for external regional task as House is twirled in the fox trot of area backup. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Waitering and waitressing at Christmas dinner for family of Perth millionaire nets \$100 tip for sustenance coffers.

Internal: House sends Karen and John to Community Training Consultation in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Hanging ten while the external situation pushes House to hang fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: South Australia state campaign command post is launched with enthusiastic core regional colleagues meeting, state committee contacting and inkind collegiums.

Internal: Liz Banks visits and leads authorization collegium.

Contradiction: Moving on the decision to be the command post. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: CTC strike force of Barry Oakley and Terry Weygandt arrive to collect \$100 from state committee member and \$500 from Nabisco as the first of their annual gifts for 1979 and 1980. Transrational models for state campaigns are taking new forms.

Internal: Finance forms are brought up to date and ready for audit.

Contradiction: Forging regional models that will release Area Council consensus without pre-empting that consensus. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Visit to Sr. Cohn at Lake Cargellico assures local support for health proposal for Murrin Bridge auxiliary (three salaries) and local health care workers. Federal Assistant Director General of Health, Dr. William Langsford, says he will "tee up" state authorities for smooth running of the grant—all before June!

Internal: Banks is sent out to Brisbane to set up command post for TMs with Marge Tomlinson, and then back to Melbourne to continue in command post there.

Contradiction: Involving all young HDP "graduates" returned from several countries in TM set up. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Whole House participates in Adelaide Area Council. First corporation check (\$250) for CMA arrives from Hastings Verring. Long weekend holiday enables House to set up for "Mango Tango" CMA maneuver.

Internal: House transforms nine rooms in "Path of Glory" blitz.

Contradiction: Connecting the vitality of the mission to colleagues' lives. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: A community meeting place is created on the site of the proposed community hall, and a two-week community methods training workshop for community leaders is launched. Major wins in industries set-up include an initial contract for sewing 500 mattress covers, positive commitment from Edgells to work through a market garden contract, and inkind of welding and wood-working equipment. Saturday workday creates a now much-used adventure playground.

Internal: CTC grad, Angelika Furnrohr, arrives to sojourn for three weeks, and Owen Bull arrives as staff for the leadership training workshop.

Contradiction: Reading community consensus relative to auxiliary interface. (Wk. 8)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: The forming of a new showplace choir to sing on the weekly radio program and the translation of a song into Marshallese catalyzes the writing of an entirely new showplace song.

Internal: House sends out three to Jaluit atoll on tiny field trip ship.

Contradiction: Keeping new decisions of community alive in midst of ambiguous task and remaneuvering. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Nation comes to the village through a two-year dental experimental program for the school children. District doctor will visit weekly, and Rotary member offers help of club members. Two stakes demonstrate corporate action with continuing daily work on pig fence and completion of nursery and garden.

Internal: New teaching job at Morman College provides sufficient funds to meet budget and release creativity for other arenas.

Contradiction: Allowing the village to see that new life in Salani is based on their decision and creativity. (Wk. 8)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: A luncheon with the Mission saturation sponsoring committee lays the groundwork for the upcoming Economic Community Forum.

Internal: "A Miracle a Day" maneuvers prepare the House for the Panchayat visit and the arrival of the Rebstock family.

Contradiction: Breaking loose a new burst of strongholding from advantages occasioned by the Panchayat visit. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Cusick daycare is now fully licensed and becomes first licensed one in the county. Community reaches consensus on the pre-application for HUD funding towards housing rehabilitation. Also Cusick is only school district (including Spokane) to pass school bond and community forms task forces to design new school. School committees are formed solely on local initiative.

Internal: Eight guests, Development team, an assistant on writing the HUD proposal, and Guardians from Boulder, Colorado, to work on commercial PSU, keep the House on its toes.

Contradiction: Ensuring that auxiliary moves with shadows in the community. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Cascade Eclipse Maneuver reports sun is now in position as 20 plus events are scheduled in three locations, including five CYFs, three ECFs and numerous TMs. Invitation replies begin to come back for Movement event during Panchayat visitation and a new northwest brochure is mocked up.

Internal: Ecclesiola has become great transition from Week I to Week II during intensity of maneuvers and full cadre is in attendance to struggle with issues of women and the need for many new answers.

Contradiction: Creating a saturation happening in the midst of doing a series of events here and there. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Overall strategic review session breaks loose authentic way to configure into regional impact and building the Movement taskforces. House becomes the training center with a kickoff training night on the ECF.

Internal: Ecclesiola is led by metro colleagues with 17 around table to take first look at *Alternatives* and write riddles.

Contradiction: Building the story that will allow people to risk with confidence and move with courage. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Week II maneuver session develops eleven maneuvers to focus expenditure for next 60 days. Calls from Phoenix, Sun City and Taos set TM dates to build saturation maneuvers around.

Internal: House helps shuffle Panchayat members around for Pisinemo visit and have first ecclesiola on this quarter's construct.

Contradiction: Redesigning army since volunteer forces volunteered in different form than expected. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: After workday in December, Santa Cruz stake self-initiates major workday including trimming trees with district chainsaw and moving junk cars. Recently opened health center schedules classes in first aid and initiates diet club to complement extension cooking classes.

Internal: Auxiliary and Panchayat team take outing to Ventana Cave on Papago reservation, home of five civilizations dating back 10,000 years.

Contradiction: Coordinating the swirl of practices of the laundromat opening so that excitement peaks at the opening itself and the community appropriates its historical significance. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: A brand-new newsletter is mailed to 360, combining the Billings regional letter with the continental Campaign News, made possible by a revised mailing list.

Internal: A morning House Church of only bread and wine is intensified discontinuity for House.

Contradiction: Keeping strategies clear over the long range, while doing maneuvers of indirection. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Frozen pipes, broken equipment and overflowing septic tank cause community to rally around day care needs, and break loose unexpected awakenment.

Internal: House entertains Tom and Esther Lyman in Bismarck as a thank you for all their support.

Contradiction: Doing the Project as a global demonstration, not as actions constantly shifting according to the whims of politically motivated bureaucrats. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Four maneuvers in three different stages (one in sustaining, two in set up, one in preparation) along with large Academy mailing and implementing office maneuver keep House and colleagues on the move.

Internal: House Town Meeting has the place a-rockin' as everyone helps create proposals, then ends with all singing House song.

Contradiction: Creating step-by-step models to being off Brighton and Laramie (Wk. 8)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Mail order saturation campaign takes form with requests for endorsement going to all corners of Edmonton and Yellowknife Regions, with the annual report drafted, financial statement completed, and publicity materials prepared.

Internal: Phase I captures the week with a cluster report and an evening of French songs and a French send out.

Contradiction: Arming the warriors with the effective assignment, story and tools to win the war in the midst of many battles. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Three campaigns spin together producing a local Nanaimo frame, \$1300 in-hand for Development and intensified engagement through North Vancouver slide show—one to Guardians meeting and one consultant to Minto.

Internal: House welcomes Yvonne Meyers (back from Australia) and Tickner family to House Church.

Contradiction: Utilizing regional resources to increase the momentum of Development and saturation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Village elder asks where House will put families, then offers his daughter's house. To finalize auxiliary facility needs, McCall Inc. of Fairbanks loans a 60-foot trailer to be converted to family rooms. Other inkind victories include butter, coffee and coffee makers for Consult.

Internal: Gretchen Emperiale phones to find House, attends ecclesiola and says yes to attending the Minto Consult—all in a week's time.

Contradiction: Keeping spinning plates spinning while spinning new plates. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Planning meeting with Reverend Bill Wall opens doors to targeted local community. Saturday evening guest night features slide show and great discussion on human rights.

Internal: Two new permeation jobs begin and one temporary job concludes.

Contradiction: Releasing the multiple options and building the symbolic victory. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Winnipeg House spends four days for economic trek in Winnipeg.

Internal: House celebrates 25th anniversary of Art and Jean Smith.

Contradiction: Catalyzing participation in events. (Wk. 8)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Riverside TM draws 60 participants with Micky Leland, U.S. Congressman, leaving very excited. Three teams visit two metros. Development circuits raise \$1,000 and Western Front breaks open Guardian and patron nets.

Internal: Thirty-five attend ecclesiola with Dick Whanger, Guardian, leading study.

Contradiction: Coordinating and consolidating new contacts and activities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Voice distribution covers whole town and grocery store market survey is completed after grocery store burns down. Community development corporation is ready to go. TM maneuver workshop this Saturday with colleagues from Dallas and Oklahoma City is a fine event.

Internal: Robert St. Clair and Paul Zolinski spend three days with House working on the grocery store development.

Contradiction: Tying in doing TMs with doing the tactics in the Project. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Asherton TM maneuver ends with great county-wide assembly and 21 events held. Forty register for adult education classes. Trees are planted at plaza, including 40-foot Alamos tree. Another "Welcome to Asherton" (Cheto) sign is put up. New board of directors for non-profit corporation receives results with great enthusiasm. Asherton HDP applies for \$5,000 technical assistance grant.

Internal: House garden is planted.

Contradiction: Discerning the tip of the economic wedge. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House initiates planning and set-up for several major events to bring the region to Indianhoma. Twenty meet from Oklahoma City and Dallas in Indianhoma for planning. Largest Methodist churches in Tulsa and Oklahoma City decide to send youth to Indianhoma for summer projects.

Internal: Ecclesiola held during blizzard brings colleagues together for exciting study (disarmament) and an overnight guest.

Contradiction: Re-articulating intent of the Oklahoma City urban probe on the other side of impact learnings. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: ICA submits a proposal by request from the Bette Clair McMurray Foundation to fund five GWFs. The Dallas Women's Center requests a GWF. Showings of the global film are scheduled for Week 10. North Haven UMC requests funding proposal and CYF for their MYF.

Internal: The ecclesiola seminary study of the world report is explosive for the House and metro colleagues.

Contradiction: Creating the advantage that allows an urban neighborhood to be targeted for a cluster. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Six more TMs are done and East Central Planning and Development District is launched. Fifty-six women from southern half of state attend GWF in Gulfport. Five Pace VISTAs complete week of training in Jackson. Planning for February 24 Pace TM gathers momentum.

Internal: Frances Roper comes in from three months on road with TM and Sandy Powell is sent out.

Contradiction: Getting the number of key people to the TM so that a deep, corporate decision gets made relative to the next two years. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Ten TMs are set up in Marksville maneuver. Five thousand leaflets are printed and distributed in Leesville.

Internal: New Orleans cadre meets with House after House Church to plan New Orleans maneuver.

Contradiction: Coordinating TMs and CYFs through precision orchestration, set-up and training. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: House visits over dinner with Betty Gee, a colleague who attended slide show, and talks about GWF in Memphis. Two appointments are set with local pastor for slide show presentation scheduling.

Internal: House inkind four cars for North Mississippi TMs in March.

Contradiction: Creating the decor that holds the urgency of maneuvers and recruitment. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: House works three fronts with one Day I troop. Atlanta Candler-Glenwood has battleplan. In Wilmington, five TMs are set with four in the works and assembly date set.

Internal: Panchayat visit is celebrated with porkchops over the fire and ice cold beer.

Contradiction: Continuing to build the larger scope, systems and images that will sustain three fronts. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: On the eve of an ice storm, the community guilds meeting, followed the next day by a candlelight luncheon sponsored by the Community Development Association and the Institute, for key county authorization people, become globalizing events that deeply honor the community and local man's care for his neighbor. All who dared (and many did) view a premiere showing of *The World of Human Development*, hear a six-month Project report and have an opportunity to visit with the Panchayat visitation team.

Internal: Readiness for Panchayat visitation occasions depth corporateness and collegial participation of Guardians.

Contradiction: Re-laying the foundation that spins guild into maneuvering methodology. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The House visits colleagues Ron and Sue Nixon in West Palm Beach. Late night conversation and next day planning clarify plans for future stronghold there. Ecclesiola format is utilized for youth sponsors from the church who meet for the first time at the House. A community development official gets excited about using Town Meetings in Orlando.

Internal: The last items from storage are moved to the newly-rented House and a search for other furniture begins.

Contradiction: Holding the long range vision while moving the immediate mountain. (Wk. 6)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: The Valentine Ball is a phenomenal success with attendance of 2,300 dancers; bouquets go to the Uptown steering committee for exception performance. February 17, a GWF is held "at home" for 42 Chicago Nexus women and their guests. World Bank invites ICA to submit research on HDP replication.

Internal: First income tax workshop nets \$3,217.47 for self-support.

Contradiction: Keeping pace with the on-going mundanity while deploying troops to participate in the global excitement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: The 1979 CDBG funding for environmental and housing programs reaches \$51,400. Commercial school graduates this class.

Internal: HDTS guilds are formed and begin plugging into Fifth City HDP programs.

Contradiction: Grasping the objective to attack as a result of comprehensive up-front plans. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Community assembly finally happens after being postponed by one snowstorm and threatened by another. Preschool opens with fourteen. Every household income survey is completed for community HUD block grant application.

Internal: Regional workday transforms collegium room, Emerging Generation room, and kitchen.

Contradiction: Creating a focus for each guild in the midst of many possibilities. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: House and Panchayat participate in a key authorization luncheon for the business community. House receives positive reception in Nebraska to TM when contacted for first time since last spring. A dozen colleagues stay after House Church to participate in building a regional Academy recruitment plan.

Internal: The Panchayat's visit includes fantastic Movement dinner, a restful House excursion and two authorization luncheons.

Contradiction: Unblocking "he is the only one who can do" syndrome. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The week of researching and setting up the initial six urban community forum pilot demonstrations is marked with no targets falling through and many contacts initiated by groups in the city coming to the ICA, like the request from the State CETA Department to train AFDC (welfare women).

Internal: Fred Grimm, an ICA volunteer who is with the state of Minnesota, gives an account of his month-long journey to India to initiate the use and manufacturing of the three-wheel tractor.

Contradiction: Doing only that which catalyzes snowballs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Multiple visits result in multiple events in towns over 800.

Internal: House functions in spite of sole occupant's broken ankle.

Contradiction: Getting all events set in limited time to avoid protracted campaign. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Mill Shoals residents visit government agencies to make their voice heard as ECF is set for Week 9, and four TM dates are set.

Internal: New shadows emerge to represent Mill Shoals HDP to world in six TM board presentations, one regional public health, and one state public health, and one state EPA visits.

Contradiction: Focusing on the necessary victories for the month of March. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Winter Frolic meeting attendance jumps to 14, as caps and buttons are ordered, activities planned, timeline consensus reached, and everyone is involved.

Internal: Whole House journeys to Minneapolis for all or part of the week in great "\$5440 or Fight" blitz to erase Kinney deficit with antiques, labor pool jobs, bazaar, dinner and even blood!

Contradiction: Turning the Winter Frolic into a key push on visibility, stakes, guilds, etc. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: House hears live reports from Guatemala and Egypt as Wisconsin colleagues return from Projects. House completes quarter of continuing consultation with Rock County CAP after LENS.

Internal: Sojourners again enhance House life and food, celebrating Chinese New Year with Japanese feast.

Contradiction: Choosing the geography with the greatest potential. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Great week of Development breaks new ground with insurance companies, Episcopal and Catholic churches, resulting in a \$9,000 week. Jim Stovall comes in to conduct an informational meeting on CYF, resulting in one school CYF and one church CYF in the works as part of the Youth Turn-On Maneuver. First TM date set for March 16 in Louisville stronghold.

Internal: House concludes Dunne study with Indianapolis cadre grateful for the wealth of images and begins Lenten broodings on the oneness of the secular and the religious.

Contradiction: Employing the shadow principle as House moves to set up next three strongholds. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: The demonstration of CYF in Columbus wins enthusiastic response from participants and sponsoring agency.

Internal: Homemade hats, hat songs, hat dances, spirit conversation on hats and cherry shortcake bring welcome relief to a week of intensive maneuvering.

Contradiction: Maximizing the advantage of successful impact events to raise up new troops and conquer difficult terrain. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Circuits reveal colleagues from TMs ready to do more in three new strongholds.

Internal: Research Centrum: Academy visits for days of planning actuation, giving House a focus around which to do several third campaign tactics.

Contradiction: Establishing image of regular circuit presence. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Fourth Codell TM begins with announcement of \$200,000 raised and a list of community accomplishments since first TM in January 1976.

Internal: CETA salary is secured for John Poole to work full-time on TM.

Contradiction: Sorting out the complexity of troops and time organization in three locations. (Wk. 8)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Visits with 475 Riverside affirm EI/ICA work on behalf of the Church.

Internal: Executive director and staff member from Institute for World Order attend ecclesiola study.

Contradiction: Operating out of planning rather than maneuvering. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Forays into three counties kick off threesaturations.

Internal: Five weeks of framing the Pittsburgh printing world results in fine job offer.

Contradiction: Creating long-range timelines in midst of ambiguity, refusal and fear. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional Development week engages the whole region in visits to old and new colleagues, netting \$2,498 in-hand and pledges for February.

Internal: House welcomes Lisa Newkirk to the Youth cluster.

Contradiction: Training for the long-term needs of the mission/world. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Ivy City continues search into Ivy City's history with interviews with elders which uncover wealth of sources at Gallaudet College such as correspondence from the President of the college describing the booming community surrounding the college. Also uncovered is a former resident, later Assistant Police Chief, who wrote book on growing up in Ivy City.

Internal: House hosts Huang Hsin Peng in the midst of snow and cold.

Contradiction: Assigning tactics and implementaries to the maneuver arenas. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: House signs a contract with CETA for \$42,919 to provide jobs for local youth and self-support. Reporter from state's largest newspaper comes to take color photos and writes fine article on front page of second section.

Internal: Auxiliary moves to two-story house which is renovated by Youth on two days off of school because of snow.

Contradiction: Getting action focused on the long-range mission while snow, wind and cold draw attention to the immediate. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Harrisburg Metro meeting motivates metro colleagues to finalize dates for the next several events in their stronghold sustaining phase through bringing them up-to-date with the happenings in other regional strongholds.

Internal: After a CYF training event, a probation officer acts out his funding passion by inking a professional to draw an invitation for House's foundation/corporation open house and by raising \$50.

Contradiction: Discerning the imaginative Development battleplan which will allow untapped arenas to be formulated into Development sources. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: House does Longbranch framing and calling and wins decision of two local residents to do saturation events.

Internal: World Council of Churches Central Committee collegium paints picture of the fit of EI with WCC.

Contradiction: Operating out of planning mindset rather than maneuvering. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Preschoolers' parents meet as interim board to pursue license and funding and propose starting immediately the Little Peeps Playgroup of Chicken Street. Winter Carnival Committee launches plans for Starks' 184th birthday celebration.

Internal: Two Project local leaders attend House Church for the first time.

Contradiction: Coordinating time, priorities and people in front of numerous challenges. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: House holds first in a series of community workshops (GCFs) in Hartford for neighborhoods within political voting districts. First project is a field trip to municipal offices to begin voter education and is slated for March. House holds second and third training sessions for the local workshop leaders who staffed it.

Internal: House caps off busy week by seeing *Superman*.

Contradiction: Getting all strongholds moving so as to increase visibility and impact. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Development week is launched with regional celebration including TM cluster planning and claiming of promises. Two surprise checks bring cash in-hand to over \$1,200 to date. Moving on the firewood industry is symbolized by obtaining \$1,000 in loan money and orders for 250 cords of wood.

Internal: After a week of continual car crisis, okay comes on financing of used pickup truck.

Contradiction: Turning commitment, labor and materials into capital for the firewood industry (turning spirit into matter). (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

Internal: Study of the *Alternatives* gives a surprising overview and pull-together of news events over the past ten years.

Contradiction: Wanting to focus on one arena of activity for sake of emphasis. (Wk. 7)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House discovers appropriate timing of GWF as inquiries come in, many colleagues get caught up in swirl and maneuver for funding and catalytic recruitment takes shape.

Internal: Collegiums, mailings and calls push corporate story and keys to communicating it.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate stance in midst of individual assignments. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Two more TWCs say yes for global assignment to HDPs. The context of saturation is expanded in midst of total impact strategy, with infusion of new LENS and Development possibilities in the stronghold of Toronto Metro.

Internal: Old-time colleague invites friends to a Saturday night party at the House which turns into an awakening event.

Contradiction: Creating the systems that allow 100 percent chastity to do the key part of a multi-faceted regional task. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sudbury City seems ripe for a saturation stronghold as North Leeds county chugs along. Both events will be funded by the provincial lottery at \$8,000 each. Development stays for a day to write up the northern Ontario HDP site selection and Consult proposal.

Internal: Sojourners, Robert Lapp and Nigel Weir, have a great time being on the road and participating in symbolic life, neither having any previous contact.

Contradiction: Staging the impact events for saturation major road blocks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community moves up front with LEDC community staff carrying major roles in funding proposal presentation to government review board. Three attend Atlantic trade fair with diversified product line, and Lorne HDP board meets in new formation.

Internal: House learns valuable lesson about promptness in legal matters as one car is impounded by RCMP due to illegal status.

Contradiction: Giving staff time to job search while more than full staff assigned is needed for funding, economic acceleration and living environment push. (Wk. 8)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: *Foro* (TM) state caravans are launched Monday and in first week one *Foro* is done and two set. Community youth have a day at the beach.

Internal: House's storeroom jungle is reclaimed.

Contradiction: Keeping news conversation alive when ionosphere blocks shortwave. (Wk. 7)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Five corn festivals, one in each sector at the same time, cement neighborhood identity, while local women engage in preparations for a women's event, and the sewing industry taps a local market by taking orders for school uniforms.

Internal: Discontinuity day assignments start up again this year.

Contradiction: Keeping the whole picture in sight while compartmentalizing for depth. (Wk. 8)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: A visit with the Department of Education launches research toward getting a fifth grade in Bananeiras. Feces program gains momentum with 30 already tested for parasites. Projete Rondon visits HDP with doctors, nurses, medicines, education materials and latrine plans and stays overnight, speaking at evening gathering and working with the auxiliary. The community center, newly acquired, is painted and refurbished. Fleischman Royal Company promises on-site training for community bakers as well as scholarships to baking school in Rio. Call with IADB's rural electrification man makes power lines by June seem a reality. Home garden class plants garden.

Internal: Ecclesiola sodality on Vogar HDP delights local auxiliary in the midst of heat wave and torrential rains.

Contradiction: Practicalizing the commissions and staking dynamic. (Wk. 8)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Space transformations abound as demonstration garden is replanted, tool pool shed construction begins, and stakes do workshop on town master plan. Baptists are added to ITI host committee as impact team makes first island circuit for ITI.

Internal: Eating and selling first batch of self-support chickens, House hosts J.S. Dethe from India and Amos Grundahl, Wisconsin farmer, experiencing all systems go with four on the road.

Contradiction: Broadening and deepening stake meeting participation as launching pad for final dash to finish line. (Wk. 7)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: A \$1,300 check for bakery helps in many areas. Eight farmers visit drip irrigation demonstraion, are convinced it is possible, and then return home to install their first demonstration of same. Sixteen adults attend the first in the new series of literacy classes.

Internal: Carnival month surprises foreign auxiliary, accustomed to a one day Mardi-Gras, but all adjust with a fine workday celebration.

Contradiction: Securing \$5,000 immediate funding. (Wk. 8)

WEEK EIGHT

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a week of both break-open events and follow through results as check for \$3800 arrives from Department of Labor, Michigan, and Bay City, Michigan sets up demonstration forum for \$200. Ten metro cadre people in Detroit Region support the new India village Project directors at \$144 each. Mrs. Bedell sets up appointments and Ivy City site visits with key authorization figures. Eight people raise some \$5,000 and leave for Maharashtra and Roy Stansbury arrives. February grassroots mailing from Chicago nets \$800 in first two days' responses. Eastern Front of Chicago Nexus Continental Patrol uses Canadian clout with New York Insurance Company and submits \$5,000; partners on these calls are operations troops. The key contradiction lies in the arena of static images of Development roles such as "patrol" and "command post" seem to deny the new orbit, leaving centrum without adequate accountability structures.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the second *SEAPAC Soundings* is published on schedule, *The Journal* goes to the bindery and a 42-page Lenten observation manual is produced and distributed in response to Priority 12. Methods modules and leadership training treks in Areas Singapore, Sydney and Chicago deal with Priority 11. Guest Nan Bailey in Hong Kong and guest artist painting mural in the Student House, challenge and revitalize the decor and self-consciousness, enabling the fulfillment of Priority 13.
