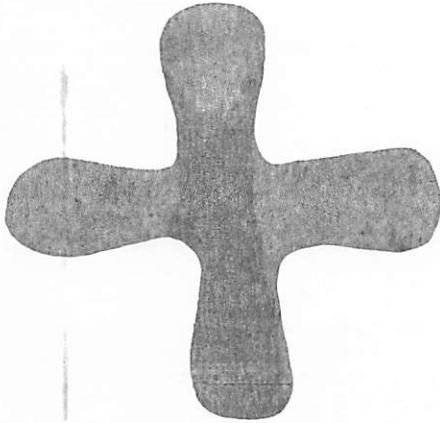

WEEK ONE

JANUARY 1—7, 1979



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Stuart Hampton, as trustee of ICA Charitable Trust, receives letter from EEC (European Economic Community) and notification of grant to ICA for 189,310 pounds sterling, largest grant yet awarded in Europe. Sisters of Sacred Heart promise at least 200 STG.

Internal: House plans quarter's maneuvers and internal life in midst of snow storm.

Contradiction: Mushing through the snow and ice into a new orbit of polis when the car won't even start. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Showers of blessings arrive in the form of 200 British pounds worth of ink and paper plus transportation, 100 British pounds in checks and two Glasgow businessmen to January London LENS. House builds polis coverage battleplan for next two quarters' to take to area council.

Internal: Return of House members from Continental Council brings victory stories and consensus for balance of the year.

Contradiction: Injecting regional spirit into a fine set of continental maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Management Board builds their capital funding timeline and community women build their model for sewing industry, while 50 Guardians receive their Christmas cards and last quarter's TMs breakdown impact event possibilities.

Internal: One hundred twenty-eight pound salary check comes in as House returns from exciting Area Council in Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Forming community consensus about use of community space. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

When the Lord has given you the bread of suffering and the water of distress, he who is your teacher will hide no longer, and you will see your teacher with your own eyes.

Isaiah 30: 20

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House sends out first newsletter since September as first step in tying together the national GCF campaign network.

Internal: The whole House journeys to Brussels for Continental Council to participate in prioritizing the catalytic tasks.

Contradiction: Telling the releasing story that elicits engagement out of the urgency of history. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Week of Development nets \$2,000 from religious orders in Rome.

Internal: The battle to keep warm is launched with an incredible kitchen celebration with popcorn, roasted chestnuts and readings from *Roots*.

Contradiction: Making the structures of Italian society aware of the death ground they are on. (Wk. 11)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Sewing factory reorganization highlights week with factory staff at 43, price renegotiated 15 percent higher, and auxiliary manager ready to hit the road on circuits and councils for four straight weeks. Twelve new sewing machines are purchased and first day of pillow production hits 488. Mr. Sanni of Fishermen's Guild goes out on Enugu circuit.

Internal: House sends out Richard Kitney to join his family in Brussels, while ecclesiola seminary is eagerly sampled amidst a desire to take a day out to feast on it.

Contradiction: Moving Project responsibility to the village. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

Internal: The Guardians event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakenment and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyshock arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House completes polis coverage in first metro with two more Dorpsdag dates set, with help of Bentelo Dorpsdag grads. House completes polis gridding and puts all 108 polises on the map. Slide show for Trappists yields \$50 cash and \$250 working.

Internal: House decides to win on self-support by moving out of facility, and takes the first step by giving notice to the landlord.

Contradiction: Practicalizing grand strategy and getting moved into new facility, so that House can hit the road January 1. (Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Seven TMs this week bring total for November to 20—close to the pace needed to meet the year's objective. Target for Austria TMs for year 1978-79 are accomplished. Formulation team does individual visiting and deepens cadre commitments, resulting in greater participation in all three metro cadres.

Internal: TM team sees the possibility of completing the 216 Germany TMs, even with both Manfred and Hannah Golda going to spring Academy.

Contradiction: Participating in reflection that overcomes cynicism and crippling guilt. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP:

External: Community engages in a post Christmas market clean-up. Presentation on the new community center is made to the community. Lions Club donates 3,500 DM worth of materials for children's program. Printer agrees to print Kreuzberg Ost brochure in kind.

Internal: Over 400 invitations to third Sunday in Advent Open House are sent out.

Contradiction: Keeping the necessary tension between particular Project doing and caring for the globe. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Enthusiastic Kapini youth (12-20) gather for Saturday CYF and make plans for launching youth club. Three huge

bulldozers transform Kapini HDP space as new roads; bridge and Kayosha River spillway are created just as rains begin. Five graduated farm trainees start five weeks of training in poultry at government farm. Commerce and industry push ahead as Guardian catalyzes new roofing industry, following successful research with flour bags and cement. Thirty bags of wool arrive for spinning industry, and general store is daily supplied with basic foodstuffs such as bread, sugar and milk. Community workday stumping at the primary school foundation is made easy with local songs.

Internal: Walter Nkana, commerce and industry gun, begins intern year.

Contradiction: Increasing community leadership and participation to keep up with Project development spiraling. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: On-going spruce-up of village signs, remodeling of community center, and intensified community visits coincide with visit by USAID evaluation team.

Internal: Great Week I feast celebration shared with House, village and USAID team features songs from the five nations represented by auxiliary (Egypt, Philippines, Indonesia, Australia and America).

Contradiction: Quickly completing the last two months' maneuvers while launching the next phase. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: KAWATAX, the sewing industry, is launched with contract of mattress covers to be done in three weeks. Village tailors bring machines to industry as work begins. HCT weighs 28 babies in focus stake. Czech co-op representative visits Kawangware and is excited by Co-op and offended by mud. Fantastic hosting is done by Co-op Chairman, Charles Kimotho, who particularly impresses the man with the scope of the Co-op and the role of the ICA. Farmers and Boivin spend day visiting the fish farm. Assistant Chief of Kawangware, Mr. Kibe, walks four miles with VM team to find he must recruit the meeting, then brings tea and pork for celebration. In three workdays Stakes 4 and 5 put up bulletin boards and Stake 2 finishes new drainage ditch. Two light poles are inked for huge lamp that will light up the whole square and market.

Internal: Meg Wildhack returns to Kawangware as she awaits word from Kapini, her destination.

Contradiction: Enabling structures to build comprehensive models that implement timelines. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: One hundred turn up for work day and finish pouring concrete for one nursery floor and lay foundation for the Standard 4 class, ending with a cultural celebration in the newly finished community center with a feast of cabbages and harvest from the demonstration farm donated by the agriculture guild. Construction industry starts with 312 soil-cement blocks per day as the rabbit and poultry program and community kitchen put in their orders and shine in their new blue building industry uniforms. Farmers plant 600 gum and 500 jacalanda trees as rains keep pouring non-stop.

Internal: Kamweleni celebrates Thanksgiving with the Kawangware House in Kamweleni as the House moves into the completed community center on the same day.

Contradiction: Moving it without saying "no" to meet with the timeline. (Wk. 12)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Sikroar HDP (Delhi) is launched with villagers, government officials, six villagers from Maharashtra Projects and sponsor Mr. Lal of Eicher Tractors.

Internal: House welcomes Judy Montgomery and Manuel Guillot to current round of NGP Consults and Pandit and Naneshor from Maliwada in Bombay to participate in MSSIDC (Maharashtra State Small Industries Development Corporation) exhibition selling silver jewelry and ornaments from the Project.

Contradiction: Creating the do-ment in an increasing number of villages that will sweep all Project villages into development with an average of 2.6 staff per Project in 100 Projects. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghaziabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Four-acre papaya plantation is weeded. Thirteen residents apply for piggery units. The first 12 kgs. of rope are sold. Thirty new blankets are produced with a new design. The health clinic receives all new decor and paint and the District Medical officer spends the night as government officials tour medical facilities. Thirty thousand cubic feet of gravel are laid on the first segment of the Nadlapur to Dakir road, initiating the first installment of a 60,000 rupees government contract.

Internal: Two German students spend a day in the village and the Jenkins spend a night enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Choosing from and focusing on some of the multitude of possibilities that come daily from government officials while holding them accountable to their role. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: New possibilities of colleague participation are seen at Open House for Consults and Development. Appointment with local solicitor sheds new light on Singapore registration.

Internal: House continues permeation search with one remark being, "You should register with the professional services. I'm sure you would be granted a visa."

Contradiction: Moving ahead full steam as more are assigned to Development circuits, Consults and HDTs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: In anticipation of Chief Minister's visit, efforts are intensified for visible signs. Drums arrive in order to begin work on toilets. Lawnmower is loaned from district office. Health caretaker signs go up. Development also raises over \$2,000 in first week of Sabah fund raising.

Internal: Kim Thornton arrives for Development with first 10 copies of document in hand.

Contradiction: Transforming village disillusionment of auxiliary miracle workers into resolve to pull off Project. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Both Mara Committee of 16 and Stake Meeting are led by villagers with real professionalism. Stake 4 decides to again hold English classes, but to insure its continuance, assigns three youth to teach and auxiliary to aid them in writing curriculum. Twenty-one farmers meet and organize scheduling for two rented kabotas. Appointment with the Deputy Minister of Education holds unexpected surprise with presence of the Directors of Education for both the Sabah and Sarawak.

Internal: Program phasing workshop gives clear picture of where Project is and what thrust is next.

Contradiction: Moving all stakes along toward self-reliance. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Construction begins on fifth chicken house, giving one per stake. Daily village leadership training begins. International Nickel visits. Villagers name the three villages (Nurdin, Asam, Dahung) *Nurada*—which means "light exists". A new song, *Nurada*, is written in stake meeting to symbolize the new name. The Governor sends a letter to local and central government directing government support for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Alice Wright after assisting with USAID proposal writing in Jakarta, is sent out to Medan to participate in GCF at University of North Sumatra.

Contradiction: Operating out of the new images and structures necessary to give form to the new spirit breakloose. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: New dimensions of activity and local decisions of community responsibility are realized as new Camat visits and talks on development, GCF Bubun rearticulates vision and struggles with challenges and proposals, and five villagers attend Kwala Langkat GCF as preparation for becoming leaders. Books are donated for library and English classes, village committee (LSD) decides profits from oil sales in Bubun go to social programs (preschool salaries), and drama becomes part of preschool and English curriculum.

Internal: Whole new face and form of auxiliary emerges as all train, train, train and then pull off two great GCFs. Eleven staff and two babies go by fishing boat, returning in time for breakfast the next day. Andrew Jeffries from Australia adds drama to ecclesiola and auxiliary celebration picnic.

Contradiction: Holding perspective of Project over against two weeks of very little income with two more weeks expected. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Village leader, Paujung, spiritizes and motivates the 67 present at the guild meeting, creating an assignment/accountability structure by stakes which produces full participation in the workday which repairs a badly needed road.

Internal: Hockley/Mielke wedding reception, December 21st, becomes a village planned celebration and motivates the completion of many tactics. Ten horse carts are painted blue and the driveway is repaired.

Contradiction: Streamlining maneuver methodology so it can be used in guild and leadership meetings, with key overall maneuvers emerging. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Sandoz gives 1,000,000 yen (5,000 USD) for second year in a row, and commits one person to work with GCF in Japan. Dow Chemical in Hong Kong gives first grant of \$2,500.

Internal: Dunne study pushes to new depths.

Contradiction: Creating an image for the next two quarters that informs how to finish this one. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Furama Hotel sponsors Guardian meeting for all who have worked on the land development of the Nam Wai Foundation. Panchayat and Jay Antenen also participate with global images to deepen the intense care of Guardians. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco promise substantial support for Project in fine Development call. Ten students from International School address villagers with their enthusiasm for concrete and paint, catalyzing many suggestions about visible improvements. Twenty new members receive library cards as newsletter is distributed.

Internal: The visit of the Panchayat gives all a start on the reflections needed in order to create next year's strategies. House holds quarterly celebration and receives Carl Hickey from Japan.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on needs in the community around which elders and youth can be engaged. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4—H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Largest month in Philippine Development plus conversations with two large funding agencies result in proposals for cluster and HDTs funding.

Internal: Self-support is won with largest deposited month of income earned teaching Japanese to speak English.

Contradiction: Creating a metamorphoses in sustaining models to make "the leap." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Seventy-three Development calls in two weeks result in submitted proposals for US\$42,000 with US\$23,000 promised for 1978-79 and US\$2,777 banked. Two thousand TM workbooks arrive from printer.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast is celebrated with Development team from Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Laying out the concrete "do-ments" for the next six months after creating and rehearsing a winning story through Development visits. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: HDTs has two-day whirlwind urban trip including visiting two factories, seeing *Battlestar Galactica*, going to Cebu's best disco, being videotaped at a local TV station, having an audience with the Mayor of Cebu, spending the night in a good hotel, and being hosted to lavish feast by a Guardian. Mayor of Cebu features Sudtonggan on his weekly radio show. Sherwin Williams gives paint to finish painting every house in Sudtonggan. The village's first refrigerator arrives at HDTs.

Internal: Craft Guild joins House in creating Christmas Tree out of branches and crepe paper.

Contradiction: Shifting internal designs to enable not one but five Projects. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Sewing industry gets wholesale material from Manila and begins mass production of kimonos. Biggest department store in Davao shows interest and orders samples of clothing items. Section II of training center is completed and work begins on Section III which will be the sewing industry section. Preschool takes field trip to Coke plant.

Internal: House completes move into training center just as old house begins to fall down. Potot children arrive from Sudtonggan, bringing total Emerging Generation to 16.

Contradiction: Creating the long-range community plans. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Three picturesque Sanya elders visit Nishimachi International School to receive a gift for Sanya of harvest foods, lovingly wrapped and given by the children. A three-hour workshop on Imaginal Education is held and warmly received by members of the Yokohama chapter of Parents Interested in Japanese Humanistic Education.

Internal: A House unit succeeds in locating another prospective home for Tokyo House, this time in Nipori.

Contradiction: Making framing calls without the needed leadership of established Japanese. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twenty villagers (14 men, six women) and two Jeju City Guardians attend Sunday evening meeting to greet Panchayat and see global slides. Provincial Saemaul Chief hosts Panchayat and discusses long on the interrelationship of Saemaul villages and HDPs. Methodist Church breaks ground adjacent to Training Center, symbolizing decision to work with village leadership, assuming responsibility for Human Development.

Internal: House receives Mary D'Souza, Kang Byoung Houn, and Rob Duffy for the Panchayat and experiences globality in a brand new exhilarating way.

Contradiction: Focusing the village Project tactics in the midst of auxiliary focus on regional and areal maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barr and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House sets the date for another GCF in Kumamoto, a first. Three of the House priorship go to Osaka for Area Council.

Internal: House experiences low troop level as people leave for Area Council in Osaka.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the quarter's hard maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Osaka meets the Japanese way as circuiter and metro circuiter arrive in Prefecture city to do a TM, only to learn they are being introduced to the people present who in turn are for the first time meeting each other. Development appointment with company results in a significant personal gift.

Internal: Unexpected back permeation money pulls permeation income up to date.

Contradiction: Building corporate power to effectively use forces and time to get all tasks done. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Full week on all fronts includes an extended conversation with city officials which clarifies the initial phases of a new Oyubari clinic, another prefecture preparing to turn gold with circuit to Sendai, and Regional Council of 30 which brings together business and academic Guardians with youthful circuiters for five full hours of vigorous planning.

Internal: House welcomes two new sojourn families—Mrs. Sato and two children and Miss Kazue Okuda, recent CYF graduate.

Contradiction: Broadening the vision beyond the limits of a two-year campaign. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygandt family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Sixth saturation CMA in rural polis shows that the methods work in any situation, as House leads a 30-minute planning session with Moora Rotary Club, using the data from a community survey as the starting point.

Internal: Global Slide Show again proves a winner, this time with the landlord, his father and a local colleague family.

Contradiction: Creating the history-long and world-wide context that forces tentative and solid yeses for CTC on to death ground. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide. Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Visit with Managing Director of Petersville looks good for industry for Murrin Bridge. Mayor of Springvale replies he is coming to Victoria Steering Committee Meeting and sends instructions of all special formalities. Seventy-one-year-old colleague phones in her registration for the summer program in January.

Internal: Roz Woodburn sojourns for a few days before joining the party of five Australians headed for India. John Dunne's myth of going up the mountain and returning to the valley captures everyone's imagination.

Contradiction: Nailing down all the possibilities for the CTC and the donors in the last days before summer holidays. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Canberra Guardians and government patrons' Christmas party goes off with a bang, amidst Christmas decor, wine and cheese, with 50 people in attendance. New doors open for government "ins" through informal channels at the party, with officer for Senate reviewing one of several proposals for foreign affairs at midnight after all other guests have left.

Internal: House participates in major rearrangement of Murrin Bridge auxiliary House in preparation for Federal Minister of Health's visit next week. Inkind from paint to pot—plants and cedar for kitchen cupboards—rolls in.

Contradiction: Establishing the feasibility of suggested industries at Murrin Bridge. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Two CMAs are held and Crow's Nest core meeting sets a date in February. Development proposals follow-up and 10 appointments with new prospects begin to open doors.

Internal: House yard is transformed with the use of a sickle to tear away overhanging trees and five-foot-high weeds, revealing undiscovered garden plants.

Contradiction: Allowing the region to be engaged now while building the story around next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: The poultry industry (eggs) is expanded again. Inkind cement for the floor of the industrial shed is trucked to

Murrin Bridge. Daily community sports activities include volleyball, badminton, tennis, soccer and football.

Internal: Two make trip to Canberra for planning and bring Vosler back with them.

Contradiction: Maturing and expanding the structures to work through issues and arenas of responsibility. (Wk. 10)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: The *Jikin Kalib an Bukun* (community garden) is suddenly highly visible with a six-foot woven coconut leaf fence which was assembled over the past two weeks.

Internal: Initial painting of one end of the collegium room begins "over the holidays" refurbishing of the Religious House inside and out.

Contradiction: Moving beyond the core of solid participants to new troops and deeper decisions. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Village and Project timeline are seen as the same as manpower turns out for vegetable garden, school repairs, stake meetings and publishing newspaper.

Internal: Songfest at ecclesiola impacts House and guests with corporateness.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to see the cruciality of participation at every moment in the one task of building community care. (Wk. 12)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Three slide shows by Development teams and a week of Mission Saturation contacts provide HDTs introductory.

Internal: A workshop is held after the monthly regional House Church, resulting in 11 possible names added to HDTs recruitment.

Contradiction: Overcoming the tendency to be swallowed up by the seasonal mood that nothing can be done now. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK

External: First key steps in starting the HUD process takes place with the city council adopting the Citizens Participation Plan which was created with the help of a councilwoman and the formation of a Planning Commission with all neighborhoods represented (picked by the mayor) to coordinate the HUD proposal creation. In Chicago, community person, Dick Losh, works on EDA and HUD. Last saturation event is held bringing the proposals to 13 events, including three CYFs, two GWFs, six TMs, one training event, and an assembly.

Internal: House hosts group from Idaho who heard the Cusick story, wanted to come see for themselves, and ended up considering to send one or two from Rural Development Committee to HDTs.

Contradiction: Ensuring closure on Quarter II's decisions and setting up the arenas of Quarter III's victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE SEATTLE

External: House and Metro colleagues set-up and participate in three Development teams in three locations (45 appointments) raising \$6500 with regional target of \$1800 well in sight.

Internal: Everyone experiences being "in on" the whole thrust of Development detailed reporting, record keeping and communication in three locations.

Contradiction: Creating metro circuit implementaries to keep advantages alive and moving everywhere at once. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: CYF proves to be challenging event for conciliation of youth gangs as six gang member participants sign up to be workshop leaders for their community's TM. Development team's effort moves us closer to the \$6,000. International Institute TM with resettlement workers and counselors of Indochinese refugees creates powerful symbol of a boat moving from the dark to the light of freedom. Workshop training in Spanish and English reveals that a key role of the ICA in block meetings is to introduce community members to each other so they can work together.

Internal: House is filled to brim with extra troops to pull off week's events, including new CETA workers from Richgrove.

Contradiction: Transcending the political and ethnic tensions to allow impact to happen in the urban. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Local SCF committee grants \$500 to the laundromat and several groups cooperate to plan and carry out caroling, Nativity play, pinata and food.

Internal: Christmas dinner party with Pisinemo rabbit stew is a great occasion, with sisters and new priest exchanging gifts and singing Christmas carols from a variety of nations.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and moving to solidify laundromat and HDTs decisions during Christmas week. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Montana Town Meeting Report makes its first public appearance at CYF presentations to Kiwanis Clubs and Kiwanis Key Clubs in Billings.

Internal: House enters Advent season with a traditional wreath at House Church and the December 6th St. Nicholas celebration with gifts for all.

Contradiction: Telling the ICA story strategically to overcome the unknowness block. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: The second anniversary of the Project is celebrated with a Talent Show which consists of reservation-wide talent and over 90 people from the community coming to enjoy the event. Charles Lester is high point of community collegium with his report on his trip to Pisinemo, Arizona.

Internal: New poetry and images from John Dunne's "climbing the mountain and coming back down" are exceptionally powerful this week. Hosue hosts two legal service aides who have come to the reservation to assist residents in legal services.

Contradiction: Seizing the advantage of auxiliary absence during Christmas discontinuity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inkinded wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: During Evening at the Institute with wassail, colleagues present check which brings total received to date from Advent mailing to \$70. Boys and Girls Club request a CYF.

Internal: Advent is definitely present with rituals and collegium while four are attending Continental Council. House "eases on down" to see *The Wiz* for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating a Regional Council which will sustain and engage colleagues during the Christmas season. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Grassroots mailing goes out to 180 colleagues asking for a pledge of \$12 a month for a Nava Gram Prayas auxiliary stipend.

Internal: House sends out Art Rowe and Michael Neat to the Continental Priors Council, while those at home have a weekend of celebrations with a show, *Laterna Magicka* and a church supper.

Contradiction: Moving with strength on saturation in the midst of the ambiguity surrounding immigration status of half the House. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: One bank phones another, enabling HDTs registrations for two Minto residents while Teamsters Local 959 leader offers to phone construction companies throughout the state to locate a four-wheel drive vehicle for two years for the Consult. House inkinds 200 pounds of pancake flour for the Consult.

Internal: A week chock full of Christmas festivities: rollicking office parties, Emerging Generation school Christmas program, television Christmas shows, walking three miles through three feet of snow for a tree, and lighting the Advent wreath impactfully remind us that the fulfillment of Christmastide is at hand.

Contradiction: Embodying the style of the missional family in holding the seasonal celebration and missional advantages in tension. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Final HDTs recruitment push follows Continental Council with newspaper ads and posters up around town.

Internal: Self-support maneuver has permeators working around the clock and House finishes week by joining in local church celebration with pre-Christmas meal and carols.

Contradiction: Sensing where colleagues are in their commitment in order to present the request that solicits a yes. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Two more Forums, held in the Swan River Polis, are the last before the double assemblies. The long awaited hockey equipment arrives to help outfit the Vogar Bobcats Peewee team. Store inventory is taken to enable store transfer.

Internal: Richard Kauffman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Preparation for Fifth City event is underway as Economic Development Report is completed. A meeting is set next week in Indianoma with EDA state director and two ASCOG (regional planning district) representatives.

Internal: House report for quarter at collegium illuminates new leverages and advantages unforeseen before.

Contradiction: Pushing to the forefront the cruciality of each maneuver. (Wk. 12)

Internal: The House completes facility set-up with opening of guest space in refurbished garage.

Contradiction: Welding all the troops and tasks into one thrust through structural continuity. (Wk. 9)

External: Guardian Jay Antenen is sent out to Northeast Asia trek with the Global Panchayat. Human Resurgence Mission is held in Winchester, Kentucky.

Internal: Completed master file takes away all excuses for not being ready to put out the mailing, and second big mailing of the tri-metro interchange is ready for the printer.

Contradiction: Seeing through the blizzard of immediate implementaries to Quarter III maneuvers just ahead. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Clinton County holds initial stronghold scheduling meeting by itself and decides to move in the direction of holding a Town Meeting in each school district. House and Development teams lead training event for 30 block club leaders in follow up of last year's stronghold.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with Cleveland House and colleagues, and does quarterly weatherization.

Contradiction: Framing major corporations and patrons. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: GWF sponsored by women's circle of prominent black church nets 65 in attendance and two YWCA requests.

Internal: Truckload of staples from grocery chain provides delightful ambiguity of where to put it.

Contradiction: Motivating the magnificent million. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: House extends one hundred invitations for HDTS with telephone follow up.

Internal: House sends nine to Continental Council, leaving the small House dynamic to plan the Regional Council.

Contradiction: Deciding the strategy for attaining a Development victory. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House finds TM '76 colleague still alive and asking what he can do next to pull his community together to awaken them.

Internal: Continual rehearsal of Advent and Christmas and Luther readings bring new spirit to the House.

Contradiction: Breaking away from comfortable old methods to develop the rapid set-up methods that catalyze full saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: House engages in intensive week of telephoning in preparation for regional training event for GWF and ECF in conjunction with Regional Council and to recruit participants for the HDTS.

Internal: Week of polishing the Religious House includes waxing floors and polishing furniture in preparation for Regional Council. Work is celebrated with trimming the Christmas tree at ecclesiola.

External: Widen Open Tournament becomes a reality as team installs gas pipe, uniforms and trophies arrive, and eight teams are scheduled.

Internal: Two guests come to watch House do a play at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Discerning the doing of active waiting. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Philadelphia city tri-micro core sets the date of the first TM and the first training event to initiate the stronghold in the new year.

Internal: The new Development file system, the Hong Kong system, enables telephoning long lost colleagues and getting positive responses.

Contradiction: Dramatically engaging regional colleagues to help us reach large donors for the Miraculous Million. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: As follow-through on the Week 7 Demonstration Development Week nets additional dollars, and 400 Christmas cards are mailed with letter requesting contributions.

Internal: Nine people from New York Region attend Continental Council.

Contradiction: Deciding the strategy for attaining a Development victory. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Fantastic Project meeting starts planning next quarter. First \$1,000 of local investment in firewood industry is committed.

Internal: Strike force gives report on state of the area and local party becomes strategy session for Fire Commission election.

Contradiction: Achieving Firewood Industry objectives in the face of local game-playing and approach of Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: House focuses major attention on HDS recruitment with side effect of good week in Development.

Internal: Five-sevenths of adult poulation of House attends Continental Priors' Council in Chicago. Others celebrate with super sundaes and hamburgers. New part-time job in the executive suite of GENSTAR bolsters self-support.

Contradiction: Determining how to maximize the possibilities with chances to win in many different arenas. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House focuses on HDS recruitment through religious orders and newspaper ad.

Internal: House celebrates third week of Advent tidings of great joy with cutting of Christmas tree and going to a performance of Handel's *Messiah*.

Contradiction: Getting hold of a broad frame of authorization and networks to do saturation in Halton Region and municipality. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Three government agencies call to discuss ICA plans and how they can be of help with regard to saturation funding and HDP capitalization.

Internal: A proposal for a half million to employ sixty ICA staff and colleagues across Canada is submitted and most favorably received by the Secretary of State.

Contradiction: Prioritizing complex demands of Development, HDS recruitment, self-support, saturation set-up and funding. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: The raising of the 12 foot by 6 foot sign: "Lorne—United we stand. Together we work" at the highway is the first physical sign since the fire and re-engenders pride that something special is going on in Lorne.

Internal: The Continental Council event opens House to continental focus on HDS and to create the Five Rings of Christmas Maneuver for December.

Contradiction: Attending to leadership training and community spirit life to generate productivity and community-wide momentum. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: CYF campaign in Venezuela begins with Lebanese youth. US\$10,000 is received from local church which was fifty percent of total amount raised in one event. Ecumenical Institute tax exemption status is received for donations to EI.

Internal: Thanksgiving in Cano Negro includes representatives from three nations.

Contradiction: Creating the image of "move it" in midst of seasonal and election paralysis. (Wk. 11)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Project document is presented to community and guests at grand fiesta. A logistic team meeting throughout the week enables a large group of people to bring off feast, exhibition, program for children and new decor. House hosts visitors from Miserior, a group from Germany that funded tractor for Project.

Internal: Four youth are assigned to four different family units and a group of five are sent to Continental Council in Caracas.

Contradiction: Designing auxiliary life for the next three weeks. (Wk. 1)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Two hundred community residents attend first dance since the Consult. Health survey contacts 172 people. Site is found for the bakery. Training lessons in baking bread are given to two auxiliary. One hundred-fifty cucumber plants are sown, tomato plants are weeded, and mustard greens are sold in regional market. Preschoolers visit demonstration farm and see sugar cane processing. Development nets 25,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,250) from Pan American Foundation. Program books are submitted to accountant for certification. The first Latin American interchange report is launched.

Internal: Community dance is fantastic occasion for learning how to dance the Brazilian way.

Contradiction: Designing staff configurations to effectively execute impact programs, Project catalysis, Movement formation and support systems. (Wk. 9)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: The week of *firsts* begins with overflow crowds in each of the five sector meetings and ends with emotion-filled document presentation party on Saturday, in which each family receives its own document, symbolizing its pledge to be the Human Development Project.

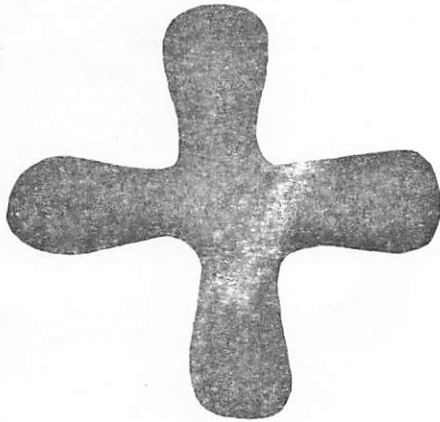
Internal: Return of Rose West from Development work in the pastures of Wisconsin brings money, promotion materials, and another welcome bi-lingual mouth.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Stuart Hampton, as trustee of ICA Charitable Trust, receives letter from EEC (European Economic Community) and notification of grant to ICA for 189,310 pounds sterling, largest grant yet awarded in Europe. Sisters of Sacred Heart promise at least 200 STG.

Internal: House plans quarter's maneuvers and internal life in midst of snow storm.

Contradiction: Mushing through the snow and ice into a new orbit of polis when the car won't even start. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Showers of blessings arrive in the form of 200 British pounds worth of inkind paper plus transportation, 100 British pounds in checks and two Glasgow businessmen to January London LENS. House builds polis coverage battleplan for next two quarters' to take to area council.

Internal: Return of House members from Continental Council brings victory stories and consensus for balance of the year.

Contradiction: Injecting regional spirit into a fine set of continental maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Management Board builds their capital funding timeline and community women build their model for sewing industry, while 50 Guardians receive their Christmas cards and last quarter's TMs breakdown impact event possibilities.

Internal: One hundred twenty-eight pound salary check comes in as House returns from exciting Area Council in Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Forming community consensus about use of community space. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break

loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House sends out first newsletter since September as first step in tying together the national GCF campaign network.

Internal: The whole House journeys to Brussels for Continental Council to participate in prioritizing the catalytic tasks.

Contradiction: Telling the releasing story that elicits engagement out of the urgency of history. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: After months of negotiating, the municipality finally gathers a quorum for a council meeting and approves five-year rent-free facility for cooperative industry. Payment of \$3,000 for 36 beach umbrellas arrives from Atlanta and women are paid. Youth gather at House on Christmas Eve.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with roast rabbit in Rome, sends Sheila to England for discontinuity, and welcomes Bob Rand for Development.

Contradiction: Picking up local man after he has won and enabling him to move to the next step. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Sewing factory reorganization highlights week with factory staff at 43, price renegotiated 15 percent higher, and auxiliary manager ready to hit the road on circuits and councils for four straight weeks. Twelve new sewing machines are

purchased and first day of pillow production hits 488. Mr. Sanni of Fishermen's Guild goes out on Enugu circuit.

Internal: House sends out Richard Kitney to join his family in Brussels, while ecclesiola seminary is eagerly sampled amidst a desire to take a day out to feast on it.

Contradiction: Moving Project responsibility to the village. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The Guardians event during the Panchayat visitation reveals 18 people ready to assume some expanded role in relation to the task of awakening and engagement.

Internal: Peter Aaron Greyshon arrives November 3, second child born to Nexus in four weeks.

Contradiction: Exploding GUF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting framing begins to come together as program is affirmed by key governmental and private church support. Secretary of the Year of the Village Committee urges doing TM under national rider of the UNICEF Year of the Child.

Internal: House is impacted by Panchayat visitation, Alan Berresford's report on India, and Lyn Wisman's report on Nigeria.

Contradiction: Mustering enough clout to move on saturation while continuing to build a national campaign network. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House completes polis coverage in first metro with two more Dorpsdag dates set, with help of Bentelo Dorpsdag grads. House completes polis gridding and puts all 108 polises on the map. Slide show for Trappists yields \$50 cash and \$250 working.

Internal: House decides to win on self-support by moving out of facility, and takes the first step by giving notice to the landlord.

Contradiction: Practicalizing grand strategy and getting moved into new facility, so that House can hit the road January 1. (Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Twenty-two young people from all over Germany spend the weekend in the Frankfurt House to participate in a tailor-made course training them in methods of human development and Global Community Forum—a 44-hour vocational consult! Four of them will spend three months in Kreuzberg, Isle of Dogs, Tai'rgwaith and Kawangware, while others are considering one-year internship.

Internal: The anticipated lull before Christmas is filled with Tolman spending two days in Kreuzberg and meeting with area priors in Brussels, the House hosting guests for Christmas celebration and sending Christmas Development mailing to 250 colleagues.

Contradiction: Mustering the patience necessary to let colleagues consider internship when the need for German staff is burning. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Community engages in a post Christmas market clean-up. Presentation on the new community center is made to the community. Lions Club donates 3,500 DM worth of materials for children's program. Printer agrees to print Kreuzberg Ost brochure inked.

Internal: Over 400 invitations to third Sunday in Advent Open House are sent out.

Contradiction: Keeping the necessary tension between particular Project doing and caring for the globe. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Enthusiastic Kapini youth (12-20) gather for Saturday CYF and make plans for launching youth club. Three huge bulldozers transform Kapini HDP space as new roads, bridge and Kayosha River spillway are created just as rains begin. Five graduated farm trainees start five weeks of training in poultry at government farm. Commerce and industry push ahead as Guardian catalyzes new roofing industry, following successful research with flour bags and cement. Thirty bags of wool arrive for spinning industry, and general store is daily supplied with basic foodstuffs such as bread, sugar and milk. Community workday stomping at the primary school foundation is made easy with local songs.

Internal: Walter Nkana, commerce and industry gun, begins intern year.

Contradiction: Increasing community leadership and participation to keep up with Project development spiraling. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: On-going spruce-up of village signs, remodeling of community center, and intensified community visits coincide with visit by USAID evaluation team.

Internal: Great Week I feast celebration shared with House, village and USAID team features songs from the five nations represented by auxiliary (Egypt, Philippines, Indonesia, Australia and America).

Contradiction: Quickly completing the last two months' maneuvers while launching the next phase. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: KAWATAX, the sewing industry, is launched with contract of mattress covers to be done in three weeks. Village tailors bring machines to industry as work begins. HCT weighs 28 babies in focus stake. Czech co-op representative visits Kawangware and is excited by Co-op and offended by mud. Fantastic hosting is done by Co-op Chairman, Charles Kimotho, who particularly impresses the man with the scope of the Co-op and the role of the ICA. Farmers and Boivin spend day visiting the fish farm. Assistant Chief of Kawangware, Mr. Kibe, walks four miles with VM team to find he must recruit the meeting, then brings tea and pork for celebration. In three workdays Stakes 4 and 5 put up bulletin boards and Stake 2 finishes new drainage ditch. Two light poles are inked for huge lamp that will light up the whole square and market.

Internal: Meg Wildhack returns to Kawangware as she awaits word from Kapini, her destination.

Contradiction: Enabling structures to build comprehensive models that implement timelines. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Workday marks first progress in dam-building in Kamweleni in 23 years, and draws 39 participants with representation from each stake and from the nearby village of Mulindi. The building of 43 washstops in one day lays groundwork in soil conservation which must be initiated before the government will authorize the building of a dam. Nairobi Development call shows that a successful community developer does not have to speak English or be literate.

Community leadership increases as stake leaders visit every stake with auxiliary and most stakes assume responsibility to install their own call bells for stake meetings.

Internal: Augustine Hajega returns from week of siteselection and Village Meetings in the coast province.

Contradiction: Enabling auxiliary to demonstrate the corporate style necessary to catalyze Iron Men in Kamweleni. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Sikroar HDP (Delhi) is launched with villagers, government officials, six villagers from Maharashtra Projects and sponsor Mr. Lal of Eicher Tractors.

Internal: House welcomes Judy Montgomery and Manuel Guillot to current round of NGP Consults and Pandit and Naneshor from Maliwada in Bombay to participate in MSSIDC (Maharashtra State Small Industries Development Corporation) exhibition selling silver jewelry and ornaments from the Project.

Contradiction: Creating the document in an increasing number of villages that will sweep all Project villages into development with an average of 2.6 staff per Project in 100 Projects. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghazlabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is re-vamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for Herigens. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: HDTs Sudtonggan concludes. Assignments Commission in Sydney, using troops from Singapore and Chicago Nexi, do rebalance on Area Sydney troop configuration. Evening with key Guardians and families is held in Singapore.

Internal: Two-thirds of Global Research Centrum: Singapore return with reports from Areas Hong Kong, Singapore and Sydney.

Contradiction: Developing structures to allow House to coordinate cross-centrum tasks and monitor internal life. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: In anticipation of Chief Minister's visit, efforts are intensified for visible signs. Drums arrive in order to begin work on toilets. Lawnmower is loaned from district office. Health caretaker signs go up. Development also raises over \$2,000 in first week of Sabah fund raising.

Internal: Kim Thornton arrives for Development with first 10 copies of document in hand.

Contradiction: Transforming village disillusionment of auxiliary miracle workers into resolve to pull off Project. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Both Mara Committee of 16 and Stake Meeting are led by villagers with real professionalism. Stake 4 decides to again hold English classes, but to insure its continuance, assigns three youth to teach and auxiliary to aid them in writing curriculum. Twenty-one farmers meet and organize scheduling for two rented kabotas. Appointment with the Deputy Minister of Education holds unexpected surprise with presence of the Directors of Education for both the Sabah and Sarawak.

Internal: Program phasing workshop gives clear picture of where Project is and what thrust is next.

Contradiction: Moving all stakes along toward self-reliance. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Construction begins on fifth chicken house, giving one per stake. Daily village leadership training begins. International Nickel visits. Villagers name the three villages (Nurdin, Asam, Dahung) *Nurada*—which means "light exists". A new song, *Nurada*, is written in stake meeting to symbolize the new name. The Governor sends a letter to local and central government directing government support for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Alice Wright after assisting with USAID proposal writing in Jakarta is sent out to Medan to participate in GCF at University of North Sumatra.

Contradiction: Operating out of the new images and structures necessary to give form to the new spirit break loose. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: New dimensions of activity and local decisions of community responsibility are realized as new Camat visits and talks on development, GCF Bubun rearticulates vision and struggles with challenges and proposals, and five villagers attend Kwala Langkat GCF as preparation for becoming leaders. Books are donated for library and English classes, village committee (LSD) decides profits from oil sales in Bubun go to social programs (preschool salaries), and drama becomes part of preschool and English curriculum.

Internal: Whole new face and form of auxiliary emerges as all train, train, train and then pull off two great GCFs. Eleven staff and two babies go by fishing boat, returning in time for breakfast the next day. Andrew Jeffries from Australia adds drama to ecclesiola and auxiliary celebration picnic.

Contradiction: Holding perspective of Project over against two weeks of very little income with two more weeks expected. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Village leader, Paujung, spiritizes and motivates the 67 present at the guild meeting, creating an assignment/accountability structure by stakes which produces full participation in the workday which repairs a badly needed road.

Internal: Hockley/Mielke holding reception, December 21st, becomes a village planning celebration and motivates the completion of many tactics. Ten horse carts are painted blue and the driveway is repaired.

Contradiction: Streamlining maneuver methodology so it can be used in guild and leadership meetings, with key overall maneuvers emerging. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Sandoz gives 1,000,000 yen (5,000 USD) for second year in a row, and commits one person to work with GCF in Japan. Dow Chemical in Hong Kong gives first grant of \$2,500.

Internal: Dunne study pushes to new depths.

Contradiction: Creating an image for the next two quarters that informs how to finish this one. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Furama Hotel sponsors Guardian meeting for all who have worked on the land development of the Nam Wai Foundation. Panchayat and Jay Antenen also participate with global images to deepen the intense care of Guardians. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco promise substantial support for Project in fine Development call. Ten students from International School address villagers with their enthusiasm for concrete and paint, catalyzing many suggestions about visible improvements. Twenty new members receive library cards as newsletter is distributed.

Internal: The visit of the Panchayat gives all a start on the reflections needed in order to create next year's strategies. House holds quarterly celebration and receives Carl Hickey from Japan.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on needs in the community around which elders and youth can be engaged. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4—H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Largest month in Philippine Development plus conversations with two large funding agencies result in proposals for cluster and HDTs funding.

Internal: Self-support is won with largest deposited month of income earned teaching Japanese to speak English.

Contradiction: Creating a metamorphoses in sustaining models to make "the leap." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Kaohsiung company promises \$2,800 (US) as an investment in Hai Ou marine enterprises, interest-free and profit-free.

Internal: Christmas feast is celebrated with whole House.

Contradiction: Re-maneuvering for Quarter III government advocacy of Town Meeting with due consideration of the international political situation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: HDTs has two-day whirlwind urban trip including visiting two factories, seeing *Battlestar Galactica*, going to Cebu's best disco, being videotaped at a local TV station, having an audience with the Mayor of Cebu, spending the night in a good hotel, and being hosted to lavish feast by a Guardian. Mayor of Cebu features Sudtonggan on his weekly radio show. Sherwin Williams gives paint to finish painting every house in Sudtonggan. The village's first refrigerator arrives at HDTs.

Internal: Craft Guild joins House in creating Christmas Tree out of branches and crepe paper.

Contradiction: Shifting internal designs to enable not one but five Projects. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Sewing industry gets wholesale material from Manila and begins mass production of kimonos. Biggest department store in Davao shows interest and orders samples of clothing items. Section II of training center is completed and work begins on Section III which will be the sewing industry section. Preschool takes field trip to Coke plant.

Internal: House completes move into training center just as old house begins to fall down. Potot children arrive from Sudtonggan, bringing total Emerging Generation to 16.

Contradiction: Creating the long-range community plans. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Three picturesque Sanya elders visit Nishimachi International School to receive a gift for Sanya of harvest foods, lovingly wrapped and given by the children. A three-hour workshop on Imaginal Education is held and warmly received by members of the Yokohama chapter of Parents Interested in Japanese Humanistic Education.

Internal: A House unit succeeds in locating another prospective home for Tokyo House, this time in Nipori.

Contradiction: Making framing calls without the needed leadership of established Japanese. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Voting by 90.5% of villagers in national elections to choose two assembly men from Jeju-Do is accomplished. Hur Myung Hee goes to Area Council and new assignment in Oyubari. Lee Joe Joon and James Bell attend Area Council in Osaka.

Internal: Many students visit requesting period of sojourn during long winter holiday (two months) from university, and Mr. Kim Cho Hyun begins sojourn.

Contradiction: Ensuring corporate weekly meetings of village and auxiliary to build and actuate plans. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoché family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House sets the date for another GCF in Kumamoto, a first. Three of the House priorship go to Osaka for Area Council.

Internal: House experiences low troop level as people leave for Area Council in Osaka.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the quarter's hard maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Osaka hosts Area Council for staff and colleagues from Korea and Japan. The experience of the two nations forming a single thrust and a new confidence in the future emerging marks this as an extraordinary Council. A sukiyaki dinner hosted by local Guardians is the celebrational highlight.

Internal: House learns that in this facility large groups can easily be hosted.

Contradiction: Combining a myriad of tasks into continuous celebration of Advent and Christmas. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Full week on all fronts includes an extended conversation with city officials which clarifies the initial phases of a new Oyubari clinic, another prefecture preparing to turn gold with circuit to Sendai, and Regional Council of 30 which brings together business and academic Guardians with youthful circuiters for five full hours of vigorous planning.

Internal: House welcomes two new sojourn families—Mrs. Sato and two children and Miss Kazue Okuda, recent CYF graduate.

Contradiction: Broadening the vision beyond the limits of a two-year campaign. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygandt family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Aboriginal colleague, Phillip Bartlett, does a fine pitch to local Rotary Club in request for sponsorship to the Community Training Consultation in Adelaide in January.

Internal: Fine dinner and global slide show help send out colleagues, Humphrey and Esme Park, on trip to UK and Europe.

Contradiction: Demanding boldness and wildness in projecting into Quarter III. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Visit with Managing Director of Petersville looks good for industry for Murrin Bridge. Mayor of Springvale replies he is coming to Victoria Steering Committee Meeting and sends instructions of all special formalities. Seventy-one-year-old colleague phones in her registration for the summer program in January.

Internal: Roz Woodburn sojourns for a few days before joining the party of five Australians headed for India. John Dunne's myth of going up the mountain and returning to the valley captures everyone's imagination.

Contradiction: Nailing down all the possibilities for the CTC and the donors in the last days before summer holidays. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Canberra Guardians and government patrons' Christmas party goes off with a bang, amidst Christmas decor, wine and cheese, with 50 people in attendance. New doors open for government "ins" through informal channels at the party, with officer for Senate reviewing one of several proposals for foreign affairs at midnight after all other guests have left.

Internal: House participates in major rearrangement of Murrin Bridge auxiliary House in preparation for Federal Minister of Health's visit next week. In kind from paint to pot—plants and cedar for kitchen cupboards—rolls in.

Contradiction: Establishing the feasibility of suggested industries at Murrin Bridge. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Two CMAs are held and Crow's Nest core meeting sets a date in February. Development proposals follow-up and 10 appointments with new prospects begin to open doors.

Internal: House yard is transformed with the use of a sickle to tear away overhanging trees and five-foot-high weeds, revealing undiscovered garden plants.

Contradiction: Allowing the region to be engaged now while building the story around next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: The poultry industry (eggs) is expanded again. In kind cement for the floor of the industrial shed is trucked to Murrin Bridge. Daily community sports activities include volleyball, badminton, tennis, soccer and football.

Internal: Two make trip to Canberra for planning and bring Vosler back with them.

Contradiction: Maturing and expanding the structures to work through issues and arenas of responsibility. (Wk. 10)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Fence encounters first sabotage and is repaired by community without auxiliary. Carolling in all stakes is event for entire showplace.

Internal: House is new inside with paint and decor, a perfect backdrop for Christmas decorations Marshallese style—fern garlands and a live tree.

Contradiction: Holding momentum level steady over the holidays to avoid new year slump. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Village and Project timeline are seen as the same as manpower turns out for vegetable garden, school repairs, stake meetings and publishing newspaper.

Internal: Songfest at ecclesiola impacts House and guests with corporateness.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to see the cruciality of participation at every moment in the one task of building community care. (Wk. 12)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Three slide shows by Development teams and a week of Mission Saturation contacts provide HDTs introductory.

Internal: A workshop is held after the monthly regional House Church, resulting in 11 possible names added to HDTs recruitment.

Contradiction: Overcoming the tendency to be swallowed up by the seasonal mood that nothing can be done now. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: First key steps in starting the HUD process takes place with the city council adopting the Citizens Participation Plan which was created with the help of a councilwoman and the formation of a Planning Commission with all neighborhoods represented (picked by the mayor) to coordinate the HUD proposal creation. In Chicago, community person, Dick Losh, works on EDA and HUD. Last saturation event is held bringing the proposals to 13 events, including three CYFs, two GWFs, six TMs, one training event, and an assembly.

Internal: House hosts group from Idaho who heard the Cusick story, wanted to come see for themselves, and ended up considering to send one or two from Rural Development Committee to HDTs.

Contradiction: Ensuring closure on Quarter II's decisions and setting up the arenas of Quarter III's victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: House and Metro colleagues set-up and participate in three Development teams in three locations (45 appointments) raising \$6500 with regional target of \$1800 well in sight.

Internal: Everyone experiences being "in on" the whole thrust of Development detailed reporting, record keeping and communication in three locations.

Contradiction: Creating metro circuit implementaries to keep advantages alive and moving everywhere at once. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: CYF proves to be challenging event for conciliation of youth gangs as six gang member participants sign up to be

workshop leaders for their community's TM. Development team's effort moves us closer to the \$6,000. International Institute TM with resettlement workers and counselors of Indochinese refugees creates powerful symbol of a boat moving from the dark to the light of freedom. Workshop training in Spanish and English reveals that a key role of the ICA in block meetings is to introduce community members to each other so they can work together.

Internal: House is filled to brim with extra troops to pull off week's events, including new CETA workers from Richgrove.

Contradiction: Transcending the political and ethnic tensions to allow impact to happen in the urban. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Local SCF committee grants \$500 to the laundromat and several groups cooperate to plan and carry out caroling, Nativity play, pinata and food.

Internal: Christmas dinner party with Pisinemo rabbit stew is a great occasion, with sisters and new priest exchanging gifts and singing Christmas carols from a variety of nations.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum and moving to solidify laundromat and HDTs decisions during Christmas week. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Montana Town Meeting Report makes its first public appearance at CYF presentations to Kiwanis Clubs and Kiwanis Key Clubs in Billings.

Internal: House enters Advent season with a traditional wreath at House Church and the December 6th St. Nicholas celebration with gifts for all.

Contradiction: Telling the ICA story strategically to overcome the unknown block. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: The second anniversary of the Project is celebrated with a Talent Show which consists of reservation-wide talent and over 90 people from the community coming to enjoy the event. Charles Lester is high point of community collegium with his report on his trip to Pisinemo, Arizona.

Internal: New poetry and images from John Dunne's "climbing the mountain and coming back down" are exceptionally powerful this week. Hosue hosts two legal service aides who have come to the reservation to assist residents in legal services.

Contradiction: Seizing the advantage of auxiliary absence during Christmas discontinuity. (Wk. 1)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inked wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: During Evening at the Institute with wassail, colleagues present check which brings total received to date from Advent mailing to \$70. Boys and Girls Club request a CYF.

Internal: Advent is definitely present with rituals and collegium while four are attending Continental Council. House "eases on down" to see *The Wiz* for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating a Regional Council which will sustain and engage colleagues during the Christmas season. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Grassroots mailing goes out to 180 colleagues asking for a pledge of \$12 a month for a Nava Gram Prayas auxiliary stipend.

Internal: House sends out Art Rowe and Michael Neat to the Continental Priors Council, while those at home have a weekend of celebrations with a show, *Laterna Magicka* and a church supper.

Contradiction: Moving with strength on saturation in the midst of the ambiguity surrounding immigration status of half the House. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Satellite phone calls confirm Tanana chiefs conference travel funding for HDTS and three Minto HDTS prospects. Slide show nets \$42 and two consultant prospects. Old colleagues hear Consult story during New Year's Week II.

Internal: New Year's celebration elicits unexpected guests—old colleagues and brand new ones celebrate the 10 years of the Religious House.

Contradiction: Bracketing anxieties while determining and using key leverage points for technical victories in Minto. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Final HDTS recruitment push follows Continental Council with newspaper ads and posters up around town.

Internal: Self-support maneuver has permeators working around the clock and House finishes week by joining in local church celebration with pre-Christmas meal and carols.

Contradiction: Sensing where colleagues are in their commitment in order to present the request that solicits a yes. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Two more Forums, held in the Swan River Polis, are the last before the double assemblies. The long awaited hockey equipment arrives to help outfit the Vogar Bobcats Peeewe team. Store inventory is taken to enable store transfer.

Internal: A week of improvements ends with revitalized linoleum and a small celebration that both House vehicles now have working heating systems. Two to Priors Council and prep for assemblies and Christmas puts crunch on all concerned.

Contradiction: Eliciting the decisions of the community to participate in the creation of decision-making structures. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Alice maneuver team returns home triumphant. Week is spent evaluating and setting up next tri-micro saturation. House is invited to Riverside Civic Club (Houston neighborhood) to help plan their second Town Meeting. Metro circuits are initiated with Week II trip to Austin.

Internal: Richard Kauffman, head of the Hunger Project in Houston, helps House write Quarter II maneuvers.

Contradiction: Transferring victory of Alice maneuver to San Marcos tri-micro. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Preparation for Fifth City event is underway as Economic Development Report is completed. A meeting is set next week in Indiahoma with EDA state director and two ASCOG (regional planning district) representatives.

Internal: House report for quarter at collegium illuminates new leverages and advantages unforeseen before.

Contradiction: Pushing to the forefront the cruciality of each maneuver. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Local residents do entire *La Voz* for the first time. Three are committed and two considering for the HDTS. Regional Council is held in San Antonio with 35 attending.

Internal: House disperses to Chicago, San Antonio and Brownsville. Christmas decor is up.

Contradiction: Hitting the road running after Christmas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House winds up one maneuver and begins another with Burkburnett TM (Cleburne, Texas) and mailing of quarter calendar to Oklahoma City metro colleagues.

Internal: The House completes facility set-up with opening of guest space in refurbished garage.

Contradiction: Welding all the troops and tasks into one thrust through structural continuity. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House contacts 16 agencies marketing HDTS with 12 prospects and several new contacts. Guardians meet and plan Dallas saturation maneuver using their own networks to set up events.

Internal: EDGE establishes a new financial arrangement for the House facility, moving toward a rent-free target. Ecclesiola is a great event of celebration with Glen and Pat Miller coming in from Fort Worth.

Contradiction: Recruiting HDTS and setting up a saturation maneuver during three weeks of holiday activities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: One hundred twenty-five women from around the State of Mississippi attend GWF at Governor's Mansion and have lunch with the First Lady of the state. Within the first week of state-wide mailing, 12 communities have scheduled TMs for Quarters III and IV of 1979. A planning Commission is appointed for Pace for official adoption of annexation, ordinances and future planning.

Internal: Entire House attends Continental Council.

Contradiction: Completing housing survey and HDTS recruitment before House discontinuity begins. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Three from House attend Mississippi maneuver planning where the whole sector actualizes its commitment to intensify the maneuver with twice the events in half the time.

Internal: Extended family members heighten Christmas celebration and enable great day of painting the House.

Contradiction: Forging one thrust for the quarter in the midst of broad complex commitments and scattered troops. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Six Delta towns with Delta Days TM history are visited for HDTs prospects. Towns visited seem to have journeyed since June 1977 to be more involved and more hopeful. Appointments are set with town mayors and their prospects for Week 1.

Internal: The great return from discontinuity lands Memphis House in Delta Pace for New Year's Eve and planning.

Contradiction: Focusing on a great win in Mississippi, knowing that the region and Religious House must win as well. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: House and regional colleagues plan detailed quarter maneuvers, highlighted by a workable plan to begin work in urban Atlanta.

Internal: House celebrates with Christmas dinner and stories by the fire, and creates its own drama for New Year's Eve party.

Contradiction: Finding the entrees to open up Development to fund the urban maneuver. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Ruby-Mount Grodin TM set up in three hours has 36 in attendance. Key community black man, James Harris, announces at Community Development Association meeting that he is attending the HDTs in Chicago.

Internal: The Powells are sent to Priors' Council with a CDA board meeting being called, along with ecclesiola which celebrates the birthday of a community woman for sodality.

Contradiction: Maintaining full speed ahead while not getting sucked up in the immediate race. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Two splendid CYFs with selected students from local high schools and two TMs conclude a successful Big O Maneuver in Orange County and Orlando. Development team presence gives a "big House" feel to the week making a Rotary Club presentation in Eustice which holds much promise for the future.

Internal: Celebration of the week is an all-day-and-into-the-evening, mostly-free-courtesy-of-a-colleague Disneyworld trip.

Contradiction: Sorting out details, filing information and reports and regrouping for the next push. (Wk. 1)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Fifth City facilities are completed for the opening of the HDTs. The Panchayat treks to Areas Chicago and Houston are sent out. The steering committee for the Uptown 5 Valentine Ball holds its first meeting. The centrums build maneuvers for Quarter III.

Internal: The Nexus celebrates raises received by three permeators.

Contradiction: Putting coming week in the perspective of dealing with more than the next seven days. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Inauguration of the HDTs in Fifth City ends incredible week of Project priors meeting, curriculum development, and HUD and EDA proposal writing. Christmas dance, sponsored by preschool, brings in over 150 folks. Fifth City HDP annual report and beautiful calendar are printed.

Internal: The presence of colleagues from the North American Projects brings a deep collegiality with the discovery there is one Project.

Contradiction: Wrapping up final details before the Holidays. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Friday night Festival of Lights launches Christmas season with great success. Lights on 110-foot water tower, Snow King and Queen (senior citizens), a Christmas mall (flea market), and a procession down Main Street are highlights of the evening. Over 300 people participate even though it takes place during an ice storm. The *Des Moines Register* picks Lorimor for a December 24 special story on small town community Christmas celebrations. They will be in town several more times during the month. Three TMs are held near Lorimor, and \$3,000 is received from Hy Vee Foods.

Internal: Geoff Nixon has most successful Development week of the quarter (\$11,000 in hand) and picks up surplus desks for the Development office.

Contradiction: Using Christmas momentum to solidly launch next quarter. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: With the House discontinuous, Pamela Blood goes to the airport to launch Bill Huston, a new colleague from St. Joseph, Missouri, on his way to India to help introduce the three-wheel TRAG as a transportation-agricultural vehicle.

Internal: Due to Sunday's snowstorm, New Year's Eve is celebrated again on Monday evening with a progressive dinner beginning in the Belin's apartment on the third floor, then the Loepke's apartment on the second, then the House on the main floor.

Contradiction: Trying innovative new things when you can hardly do the demands of the day. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development week consumes all in the House with raising monies as the Minneapolis Region Christmas gift to the world. Two thousand dollars is raised over and above the miraculous million bottom line of \$6,000.

Internal: "Santa's Elves" gather with caps on in the evenings to reflect on the day's victories and celebrate with wine and song each night of the Development week.

Contradiction: Defining and placing ourselves on the death ground that will insure victories for the Kinney HDP and regional saturation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Quarter planning meeting at Mill Shoals focuses necessity for maneuvering as one region.

Internal: House participates in effulgence of celebration as House hosts Dick Mark family for dinner on Tuesday, celebrates Christmas at Holiday Inn on Wednesday, ecclesiola on Thursday, goes caroling in Mill Shoals on Saturday, and holds regional House Church on Sunday.

Contradiction: Maintaining maneuver focus amidst many other treks. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Second barnwood order is stripped, employing seven youth, one supervisor and one bookkeeper, netting \$900.

Internal: Planning day produces quarter's symbol and corporate battleplan for the region, climaxing in a regional New Year's Eve celebration in St. Louis.

Contradiction: Translating auxiliary and regional maneuvers into local engagement. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Hope for first hockey team in six years becomes visible as workday completes renovated warming house and skating rink in -20°F weather. Thirty-three youth attend "Sunday Night at the Movies."

Internal: Eleven-foot Christmas tree, cut from woods, is trimmed to cap off Advent House decorating.

Contradiction: Communicating the importance of outside-the-Project trips, or how an HDP is different from self-help. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Development team raises money, HDTS prospects and new approaches to stronghold strategies.

Internal: Double study of John Dunne at ecclesiola and following morning's collegium reveals life-giving method that Dunne created.

Contradiction: Effectively announcing HDTS to people who are in transition and searching for options. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Ad in newspaper for HDTS yields many calls, interviews and one paid registration in first three days of HDTS blitz. The last TM of the quarter is held by Leiters Ford. House and three high school students travel to Fifth City to work on facility for HDTS and participate in a Chrysanthemum Yellow Miracle.

Internal: Dunne study continues to create occasions of profound reflection. The Bengels announce that their second child is on the way.

Contradiction: Creating a picture that holds all the happenings of Quarter II so that the next moves made are based on latest advantages. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Guardian Jay Antenen is sent out to Northeast Asia trek with the Global Panchayat. Human Resurgence Mission is held in Winchester, Kentucky.

Internal: Completed master file takes away all excuses for not being ready to put out the mailing, and second big mailing of the tri-metro interchange is ready for the printer.

Contradiction: Seeing through the blizzard of immediate implementaries to Quarter III maneuvers just ahead. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Clinton County holds initial stronghold scheduling meeting by itself and decides to move in the direction of holding a Town Meeting in each school district. House and Development teams lead training event for 30 block club leaders in follow up of last year's stronghold.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with Cleveland House and colleagues, and does quarterly weatherization.

Contradiction: Framing major corporations and patrons. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Ten metro colleagues plan for Quarter III Metro Council with House, and decide that the morning reporting session will write and publish a newsletter with features on Quarter II accomplishments.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 50 attending is highlighted by TM and GSD game, including three moves ahead for proper framing and two moves back for funding proposal failure.

Contradiction: Getting the three-year stronghold timeline, which is in everyone's mind, onto the wall. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: House extends one hundred invitations for HDTS with telephone follow up.

Internal: House sends nine to Continental Council, leaving the small House dynamic to plan the Regional Council.

Contradiction: Deciding the strategy for attaining a Development victory. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House finds TM '76 colleague still alive and asking what he can do next to pull his community together to awaken them.

Internal: Continual rehearsal of Advent and Christmas and Luther readings bring new spirit to the House.

Contradiction: Breaking away from comfortable old methods to develop the rapid set-up methods that catalyze full saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: House engages in intensive week of telephoning in preparation for regional training event for GWF and ECF in conjunction with Regional Council and to recruit participants for the HDTS.

Internal: Week of polishing the Religious House includes waxing floors and polishing furniture in preparation for Regional Council. Work is celebrated with trimming the Christmas tree at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating models which will engage those newly trained in the set-up of GWF. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Profound Humanness in the form of event "happens" to Ivy City all week as three days of community Thanksgiving feast preparation peaks Tuesday night prior to Wednesday night feast, and unanticipated community residents join in to help create a fantastic regional celebration.

Internal: House breaks through the events of the week to the profoundness of celebration, shifting the focus from the event to the collegiality surrounding the event.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops and assigning generalship roles and tasks to ensure the victory. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: The community celebrates with teen dance, Santa comes and is met by half the town, and 12 carolers visit every house.

Internal: House Christmas celebration reminds all of the abundance of life amidst mundane aridity.

Contradiction: Channeling unrest and bewilderment into creative care for community. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Stronghold core insists on its regular meeting five days before Christmas—making assignments, designing flyer and moving ahead to first TM event on January 17th.

Internal: Regional Council comes up with a fantastic maneuver document for Quarter III that amazes everyone and ends with a fine celebration.

Contradiction: Hitting the road on January 2 with models that capitalize on the motivity from the Regional Council, December Development push and Quarter III's initial work in saturation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: As follow-through on the Week 7 Demonstration Development Week nets additional dollars, and 400 Christmas cards are mailed with letter requesting contributions.

Internal: Nine people from New York Region attend Continental Council.

Contradiction: Deciding the strategy for attaining a Development victory. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Fantastic Project meeting starts planning next quarter. First \$1,000 of local investment in firewood industry is committed.

Internal: Strike force gives report on state of the area and local party becomes strategy session for Fire Commission election.

Contradiction: Achieving Firewood Industry objectives in the face of local game-playing and approach of Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: GWF with 20 participants, mostly black is held at the University of Bridgeport. Participants are impacted by the methods and the staff (all local/regional) is impressed by the built-in follow-up: the training events already scheduled as part of the maneuver.

Internal: The House hosts Burna Dunn of the area strike force.

Contradiction: Having a powerful conclusion to one maneuver and really launching the next maneuver. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Holiday season brings community Christmas tree and nativity scene to the schoolhouse yard and community people take full responsibility for fine New Year's Eve party.

Internal: Discontinuity takes House members to all four areas in the USA.

Contradiction: Continuing to raise visible signs that allow people to decide about engagement from their experience rather than depending on negative press. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: The first wave of the Taunton stronghold is completed and the receipt of a strong letter of authorization from the city planner, the Mayor's attendance at the Assembly, and a pledge are celebrated.

Internal: Cambridge resident, Rachel Freisecki, who joins House for an Afternoon at the Institute and House Church, turns out to be a colleague who has just returned from four months in Sol de Septiembre HDP and two months at Academy.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues from local turf to Starks for Regional Council where they can renew global vision. (Wk. 12)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House focuses major attention on HDTs recruitment with side effect of good week in Development.

Contradiction: Determining how to maximize the possibilities with chances to win in many different arenas. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House focuses on HDTs recruitment through religious orders and newspaper ad.

Internal: House celebrates third week of Advent tidings of great joy with cutting of Christmas tree and going to a performance of Handel's *Messiah*.

Contradiction: Getting hold of a broad frame of authorization and networks to do saturation in Halton Region and municipality. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Three government agencies call to discuss ICA plans and how they can be of help with regard to saturation funding and HDP capitalization.

Internal: A proposal for a half million to employ sixty ICA staff and colleagues across Canada is submitted and most favorably received by the Secretary of State.

Contradiction: Prioritizing complex demands of Development, HDTs recruitment, self-support, saturation set-up and funding. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: The raising of the 12 foot by 6 foot sign: "Lorne—United we stand. Together we work" at the highway is the first physical sign since the fire and re-engenders pride that something special is going on in Lorne.

Internal: The Continental Council event opens House to continental focus on HDTs and to create the Five Rings of Christmas Maneuver for December.

Contradiction: Attending to leadership training and community spirit life to generate productivity and community-wide momentum. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: CYF campaign in Venezuela begins with Lebanese youth. US\$10,000 is received from local church which was fifty percent of total amount raised in one event. Ecumenical Institute tax exemption status is received for donations to EI.

Internal: Thanksgiving in Cano Negro includes representatives from three nations.

Contradiction: Creating the image of "move it" in midst of seasonal and election paralysis. (Wk. 11)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: House makes increasing use of community resources: local transportation for bakery supplies, local clubs to make decor, and many Christmas songs for the songbook. All of these are used to bring off children's program on the 23rd and party Christmas night.

Internal: Groups return from Continental Council and Brazilian exchange.

Contradiction: Organizing time for reflection and analysis of the state of the Project. (Wk. 2)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Two hundred community residents attend first dance since the Consult. Health survey contacts 172 people. Site is found for the bakery. Training lessons in baking bread are given to two auxiliary. One hundred-fifty cucumber plants are sown, tomato plants are weeded, and mustard greens are sold in regional market. Preschoolers visit demonstration farm and see sugar cane processing. Development nets 25,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,250) from Pan American Foundation. Program books are submitted to accountant for certification. The first Latin American interchange report is launched.

Internal: Community dance is fantastic occasion for learning how to dance the Brazilian way.

Contradiction: Designing staff configurations to effectively execute impact programs, Project catalysis, Movement formation and support systems. (Wk. 9)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Michaelina Young and Mary Kuhajetz arrive from Milwaukee to lead a health trek that produces 346 examinations and a health mural for the plaza. Two Guatemalan bakers train local Panaderia troops to be the best in the business—and the product proves it. The local mayor and community leaders announce electrifying news: the pre-payments are complete and the installation of lights can begin!

Internal: Fernando Campos, Consuelo de Leon, George and Rose West are sent out to the Latin American Council in Caracas.

Contradiction: Orchestrating victories to create more motivity to release more victories to create more motivity, etc. (Wk. 2)

WEEK TWO

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports first Development trek to Kota Kinabalu nets 2,000 Malaysian dollars in-hand and 1,000 dollars committed. Electronics Industry (GE) in Hong Kong presents check for HK \$5,000 and Anglican Bishop Baker contributes HK \$1,500. Metro Circuit Patrol, Chicago, covers continent in one week to build House maneuvers to launch Quarter III Development. Private sector funding nets 25% new monies. Miraculous Million Campaign throws centrum into new orbit, finding command post dynamic critical to building and capitalizing on momentum. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unclarity about where death ground now lies as a result of last quarter's victory.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a week of putting in place the experimental machinery for Quarter III. HDTs: Fifth City begins with 60 students, as graduates of the Sudtonggan HDTs prepare to launch four Projects on Mactan Island. World Council of Churches central committee ends and Research representative remains in Kingston to design brochures for Jamaica ITI. Final print of long-awaited film arrives in Chicago amidst champagne toasts, a flurry of preview showings and planning for global distribution. Abstract/practical tension in Research dissolves into a new concern for machinery and network interchange that will keep Research on the road in national faculty development, spirit discernment, sensing the state of the globe and planning internal life. The key contradiction lies in the arena of accelerating new Research machine to run faster than trends; consensus and spirit are shifting in a way that captures afresh the prophetic role of Research.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports 36 more villages launched in Maharashtra, bringing the total to 102. January Maharashtra maneuvers include an 80-person strike force to accelerate the six keystone villages while maintaining the discipline of the circuits and the preparation for 60 Consults—February 26 through March 26. HDTs: Fifth City is launched in the renovated community center, while preparations for CTC Australia proceed with vigor, and ICA staff are warmly received at the World Council of Churches central committee meeting in Jamaica. Maharashtra circuits and the Philippine cluster experiment point the way to accelerated expansion and the clear possibility of the 2500. The key contradiction lies in the arena of weak reconnaissance systems supplying insufficient field data to launch the quarter with the bang the new year requires, and slowing the building of centrum maneuvers.

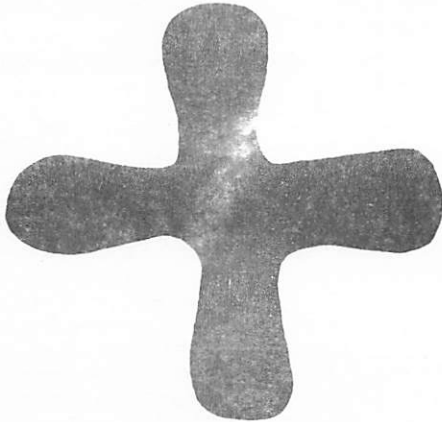
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

There is a new field confidence of management systems. The key contradiction lies in the arena of doing the now, taking care of the past while pushing out beyond.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Stuart Hampton, as trustee of ICA Charitable Trust, receives letter from EEC (European Economic Community) and notification of grant to ICA for 189,310 pounds sterling, largest grant yet awarded in Europe. Sisters of Sacred Heart promise at least 200 STG.

Internal: House plans quarter's maneuvers and internal life in midst of snow storm.

Contradiction: Mushing through the snow and ice into a new orbit of polis when the car won't even start. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development calls continue to be a spark as Honeywell call is a highlight. Brother Ogilvie, of the Marist Brothers and head of a secondary school, gives possibilities of two CYFs. A long-time colleague signs seven-year pledge equal to \$2200.

Internal: Tai'rgwaith colleagues on discontinuity get snowed in and spend *pukka* Scottish New Year in Glasgow.

Contradiction: Permitting flexibility for rapid maneuvering in midst of horrific transportation situation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Management Board builds their capital funding timeline and community women build their model for sewing industry, while 50 Guardians receive their Christmas cards and last quarter's TMs breakdown impact event possibilities.

Internal: One hundred twenty-eight pound salary check comes in as House returns from exciting Area Council in Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Forming community consensus about use of community space. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Doing the Lyon polis coverage maneuver demonstrates the power of actuating a maneuver written down before going out the door.

Internal: Whole House, though dispersed, participates in planning for the polis coverage over the next two quarters.

Contradiction: Using time in this quarter to catapult the House into the new year. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: After months of negotiating, the municipality finally gathers a quorum for a council meeting and approves five-year rent-free facility for cooperative industry. Payment of \$3,000 for 36 beach umbrellas arrives from Atlanta and women are paid. Youth gather at House on Christmas Eve.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with roast rabbit in Rome, sends Sheila to England for discontinuity, and welcomes Bob Rand for Development.

Contradiction: Picking up local man after he has won and enabling him to move to the next step. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Enugu Circuit returns with reports of three TMs held in Igbo Ukwu, all with proposals to start fish farms and small industry. Mr. Sanni returns as a man of iron, an experienced TM orchestrator, and a miracle story in himself. Hot on the circuit's heels, Mr. Unedike, of Nigerfarms Ltd., rolls in for a site visit, and invites ICA to send him two staff immediately to start an HDP in eastern village. The week of incredible visits is capped when the President of the "Progressive Society", an Ijede-based Lagos organization, drops by during Sunday House planning meeting to request assistance in arranging a bulldozer for the clearing of land for the new primary school, and ends up volunteering three people to come on the in-kind calls.

Internal: Visits to the Project by Paul Schrijnen (on his way to the CYF trek), Sisters Bernadette and Monica of the Holy Child Sisters, and six Anglican diocese officials, including the Bishop Akintembe and Archdeacon Ajayi, symbolize the presence of the ecumenical religious.

Contradiction: Moving in the fog of legality in building the sewing factory without running into a tree. (Wk. 3)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus receives the letter from EEC for a grant to India, totalling £189,000. What a Christmas present!

Internal: Brian Williams and Doris Hahn are sent out for the Africa Council on Christmas day.

Contradiction: Exploding GCF campaign in Europe without clear picture of catalytic action required. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Area Council decides all is possible: Wallonia door opens.

Internal: New intern moves in.

Contradiction: Making imaginal shift necessary to operate in short-burst maneuvers, rather than long-range strategies. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House completes polis coverage in first metro with two more Dorpsdag dates set, with help of Bentelo Dorpsdag grads. House completes polis gridding and puts all 108 polises on the map. Slide show for Trappists yields \$50 cash and \$250 working.

Internal: House decides to win on self-support by moving out of facility, and takes the first step by giving notice to the landlord.

Contradiction: Practicalizing grand strategy and getting moved into new facility, so that House can hit the road January 1. (Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: New Year's trek (five day in-residence experience) enables ten area colleagues to experience the redemptive missional family life of the Order. New Year's Eve celebration construct and closing House Church elicit awesome statements of personal understanding and transformation—also readiness for new levels of engagement.

Internal: All the Frankfurt House staff gain pedagogical experience and demonstrate corporateness during trek as the Berlin House assigns Jutta and Gottfried to staff trek children's program.

Contradiction: Getting House off the mountain top and back on the road to Jerusalem. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Two community people attend USA Ambassador Stoessel's New Year's Day open house. Community person also gives presentation on Project at Hamburg church. Reflection on New Year's Eve party reveals need for someone to orchestrate a celebrative event. Development for December tops 4,000 Deutsche marks.

Internal: House attends theater play of *Cabaret* and has image-blowing conversation on history of Germany.

Contradiction: Creating new vision for community. (Wk. 3)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Enthusiastic Kapini youth (12-20) gather for Saturday CYF and make plans for launching youth club. Three huge bulldozers transform Kapini HDP space as new roads, bridge and Kayosha River spillway are created just as rains begin. Five graduated farm trainees start five weeks of training in poultry at government farm. Commerce and industry push ahead as Guardian catalyzes new roofing industry, following successful research with flour bags and cement. Thirty bags of wool arrive for spinning industry, and general store is daily supplied with basic foodstuffs such as bread, sugar and milk. Community workday stomping at the primary school foundation is made easy with local songs.

Internal: Walter Nkana, commerce and industry gun, begins intern year.

Contradiction: Increasing community leadership and participation to keep up with Project development spiraling. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The water tank, beautifully painted with the grid and phrase, "Water is the life of Bayad," is raised to the top of the water tower by a crane contributed for the day.

Internal: House celebrates Western and Eastern Christmas with staggered discontinuities to visit Egypt and two great Christmas feasts.

Contradiction: Building on the excitement of the water system victory to intensify Bayad leadership. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: KAWATAX, the sewing industry, is launched with contract of mattress covers to be done in three weeks. Village tailors bring machines to industry as work begins. HCT weighs 28 babies in focus stake. Czech co-op representative visits Kawangware and is excited by Co-op and offended by mud. Fantastic hosting is done by Co-op Chairman, Charles Kimotho, who particularly impresses the man with the scope of the Co-op and the role of the ICA. Farmers and Boivin spend day visiting the fish farm. Assistant Chief of Kawangware, Mr. Kibe, walks four miles with VM team to find he must recruit the meeting, then brings tea and pork for celebration. In three workdays Stakes 4 and 5 put up bulletin boards and Stake 2 finishes new drainage ditch. Two light poles are inked for huge lamp that will light up the whole square and market.

Internal: Meg Wildhack returns to Kawangware as she awaits word from Kapini, her destination.

Contradiction: Enabling structures to build comprehensive models that implement timelines. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Workday marks first progress in dam-building in Kamweleni in 23 years, and draws 39 participants with representation from each stake and from the nearby village of Mulindi. The building of 43 washstops in one day lays groundwork in soil conservation which must be initiated before the government will authorize the building of a dam. Nairobi Development call shows that a successful community developer does not have to speak English or be literate. Community leadership increases as stake leaders visit every stake with auxiliary and most stakes assume responsibility to install their own call bells for stake meetings.

Internal: Augustine Hajega returns from week of site selection and Village Meetings in the coast province.

Contradiction: Enabling auxiliary to demonstrate the corporate style necessary to analyze Iron Men in Kamweleni. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Sikroar HDP (Delhi) is launched with villagers, government officials, six villagers from Maharashtra Projects and sponsor Mr. Lal of Eicher Tractors.

Internal: House welcomes Judy Montgomery and Manuel Guillot to current round of NGP Consults and Pandit and Naneshor from Maliwada in Bombay to participate in MSSIDC (Maharashtra State Small Industries Development Corporation) exhibition selling silver jewelry and ornaments from the Project.

Contradiction: Creating the document in an increasing number of villages that will sweep all Project villages into development with an average of 2.6 staff per Project in 100 Projects. (Wk. 1)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP**

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghaziabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is re-vamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: HDT Sudtonggan concludes. Assignments Commission in Sydney, using troops from Singapore and Chicago Nexi, do rebalance on Area Sydney troop configuration. Evening with key Guardians and families is held in Singapore.

Internal: Two-thirds of Global Research Centrum: Singapore return with reports from Areas Hong Kong, Singapore and Sydney.

Contradiction: Developing structures to allow House to coordinate cross-centrum tasks and monitor internal life. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Visit to District Office to check on Chief Minister's visit scheduled January 8th reveals a committee has been formed at ministry level to include District Office and ICA staff to make sure CM visit is successful. "If Project doesn't come off, we will all look bad," says Assistant to Minister of Industrial and Rural Development.

Internal: Staff begins discontinuity, but keeps working relative to CM visit in two weeks and enjoys invitations to open houses at all levels over holidays.

Contradiction: Deciding the death ground after the Chief Minister's visit that will launch the new orbit of community involvement and commitment. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGLAI LUI

External: Both Mara Committee of 16 and Stake Meeting are led by villagers with real professionalism. Stake 4 decides to again hold English classes, but to insure its continuance, assigns three youth to teach and auxiliary to aid them in writing curriculum. Twenty-one farmers meet and organize scheduling for two rented kabotas. Appointment with the Deputy Minister of Education holds unexpected surprise with presence of the Directors of Education for both the Sabah and Sarawak.

Internal: Program phasing workshop gives clear picture of where Project is and what thrust is next.

Contradiction: Moving all stakes along toward self-reliance. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Construction begins on fifth chicken house, giving one per stake. Daily village leadership training begins. International Nickel visits. Villagers name the three villages (Nuridin, Asam, Dahung) *Nurada*—which means "light exists". A new song, *Nurada*, is written in stake meeting to symbolize the new name. The Governor sends a letter to local and central government directing government support for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Alice Wright after assisting with USAID proposal writing in Jakarta, is sent out to Medan to participate in GCF at University of North Sumatra.

Contradiction: Operating out of the new images and structures necessary to give form to the new spirit break loose. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: New dimensions of activity and local decisions of community responsibility are realized as new Camat visits and talks on development, GCF Bubun rearticulates vision and struggles with challenges and proposals, and five villagers attend Kwala Langkat GCF as preparation for becoming leaders. Books are donated for library and English classes, village committee (LSD) decides profits from oil sales in Bubun go to social programs (preschool salaries), and drama becomes part of preschool and English curriculum.

Internal: Whole new face and form of auxiliary emerges as all train, train, train and then pull off two great GCFs. Eleven staff and two babies go by fishing boat, returning in time for breakfast the next day. Andrew Jeffries from Australia adds drama to ecclesiola and auxiliary celebration picnic.

Contradiction: Holding perspective of Project over against two weeks of very little income with two more weeks expected. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Village leader, Paujung, spiritizes and motivates the 67 present at the guild meeting, creating an assignment/accountability structure by stakes which produces full participation in the workday which repairs a badly needed road.

Internal: Hockley/Mielke wedding reception, December 21st, becomes a village planned celebration and motivates the completion of many tactics. Ten horse carts are painted blue and the driveway is repaired.

Contradiction: Streamlining maneuver methodology so it can be used in guild and leadership meetings, with key overall maneuvers emerging. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Tony Elizondo is sent out to first Philippine duster Consult. Development holds week-long PSU to pull together quarter's plans.

Internal: New Year's Day barbeque at a Guardian's home starts the year off with a feast.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on opportunity for new future directions in band encounters this quarter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Furama Hotel sponsors Guardian meeting for all who have worked on the land development of the Nam Wai Foundation. Panchayat and Jay Antenen also participate with global images to deepen the intense care of Guardians. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco promise substantial support for Project in fine Development call. Ten students from International School address villagers with their enthusiasm for concrete and paint, catalyzing many suggestions about visible improvements. Twenty new members receive library cards as newsletter is distributed.

Internal: The visit of the Panchayat gives all a start on the reflections needed in order to create next year's strategies. House holds quarterly celebration and receives Carl Hickey from Japan.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on needs in the community around which elders and youth can be engaged. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4-H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Meeting with national YMCA staff sets stage for second wave of GCFs covering the Philippines. Multi-national supporters are blitzed with personalized gifts of Sudtonggan abbaca craft and Sudtonggan HDP photograph.

Internal: Week of Christmas celebration meals with parish people is capped by New Year's House meeting and celebration at Manila Peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating a metamorphoses in sustaining models to make "the leap." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: ICA Taiwan's financial ledgers and books are submitted to audit company covering entire operation of ICA in Taipei and Hai Ou HDP. New Year's mailing announcing the next Philippine HDTs are sent out to 200 colleagues, friends and supporters of ICA's task in Taiwan. As of December 31, Quarter II Development income for Taipei and Kaohsiung is US\$8,850.

Internal: Quarter III planning session reveals six maneuver arenas: Development, authorization, management, troops, Taiwan circuits, and Hai Ou HDP situation.

Contradiction: Creating adequate corporate self-story and images to launch Taiwan circuits in twelve metros for the "Taiwan Gold" campaign. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: All programs "turning on" as tourist buses begin arriving each day. New kerosene refrigerator serves cold cokes and beer. Craft Guild is thrown into new universe—how to be public relations and sales persons. Thirty new "blueshirts" take assignments, ready to work right through Christmas to prepare for first Consult January 5th, with three more in the next two weeks.

Internal: Youth prepare fantastic Christmas feast for 15 auxiliary—from hors d'oeuvres to apple pie.

Contradiction: Symbolizing decision of new "assignment" which is actually the village of one's birth. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Sewing industry gets wholesale material from Manila and begins mass production of kimonos. Biggest department store in Davao shows interest and orders samples of clothing items. Section II of training center is completed and work begins on Section III which will be the sewing industry section. Preschool takes field trip to Coke plant.

Internal: House completes move into training center just as old house begins to fall down. Potot children arrive from Sudtonggan, bringing total Emerging Generation to 16.

Contradiction: Creating the long-range community plans. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Traditional Japanese week-long New Year holiday closes everything. House works on outline of two-year TM: Japan campaign, 1000 Meetings, or 20 per prefecture. New Year's letter to Japanese Houses stresses "now is the time".

Internal: House joins thousands for visit to Emperor's palace on January 2nd; Emperor and family wave to the crowds as he begins the 54th year of his reign.

Contradiction: Standing before the kairotic moment while bumping into the time-consuming step-by-step manner in which things happen. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Voting by 90.5% of villagers in national elections to choose two assembly men from Jeju-Do is accomplished. Hur Myung Hee goes to Area Council and new assignment in Oyubari. Lee Joe Joon and James Bell attend Area Council in Osaka.

Internal: Many students visit requesting period of sojourn during long winter holiday (two months) from university, and Mr. Kim Cho Hyun begins sojourn.

Contradiction: Ensuring corporate weekly meetings of village and auxiliary to build and actuate plans. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—YUH DU ERI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House successfully completes plan for next six months to activate the region. House sets up two TMs for Okinawa and Fukuoka, and confirms another in Nagasaki. Coca-Cola donates free cokes for TM. Plan for the quarter includes expanded participation in a Thursday task force night for businessmen and old friends.

Internal: House visits Dazaifu Shrine (shrine of wisdom) to begin New Year and celebrates by seeing movie, *Death on the Nile*.

Contradiction: Reminding House of death grounds indicatively present and created in order to determine wins necessary for the week. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Osaka hosts Area Council of staff and colleagues from Korea and Japan. The experience of the two nations forming a single thrust and a new confidence in the future emerging marks this as an extraordinary Council. A sukiyaki dinner hosted by local Guardians is the celebrational highlight.

Internal: House learns that in this facility large groups can easily be hosted.

Contradiction: Combining a myriad of tasks into continuous celebration of Advent and Christmas. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Full week on all fronts includes an extended conversation with city officials which clarifies the initial phases of a new Oyubari clinic, another prefecture preparing to turn gold with circuit to Sendai, and Regional Council of 30 which brings together business and academic Guardians with youthful circuiters for five full hours of vigorous planning.

Internal: House welcomes two new sojourn families—Mrs. Sato and two children and Miss Kazue Okuda, recent CYF graduate.

Contradiction: Broadening the vision beyond the limits of a two-year campaign. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygandt family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Waiting and waitressing at Christmas dinner for family of Perth millionaire nets \$100 tip for sustenance coffers.

Internal: Housesends Karen and John to Community Training Consultation in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Hanging ten while the external situation pushes House to hang fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oombulgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Community Meeting: Victoria has a winning week with its first meeting of the state committee and another \$6,000 arrives bringing total front-end funding to \$13,500 from foundations, corporations and donors. Mark Grundy departs for six months in India.

Internal: House welcomes Owen Bull and Isobel Bishop, returning from Philippines HDTs, and has great Christmas breakfast including Pavlova and fresh strawberries.

Contradiction: Using discontinuous time to set stage for 1979. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Two months intensive authorization push ends with winning call to Sir John Crawford, top World Bank Advisor for funding for India, advisor to CIDA, and advisor to Australian Prime Minister. Sir John promises to visit Maliwada early in February. On the same day, Federal Department of Health invites House back, after having said no salaries for Murrin Bridge HDP, to talk again, and this time helps to write proposals for direct grant to ICA.

Internal: House receives Sisters Betty McGee and Janet Hughes to talk over getting authorization from their order to work in Latin America for two years, beginning late 1979.

Contradiction: Following up authorization calls and proposals, and getting industry (vegetables for canning) into Murrin Bridge all at once. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Two CMAs are held and Crow's Nest core meeting sets a date in February. Development proposals follow-up and 10 appointments with new prospects begin to open doors.

Internal: House yard is transformed with the use of a sickle to tear away overhanging trees and five-foot-high weeds, revealing undiscovered garden plants.

Contradiction: Allowing the region to be engaged now while building the story around next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: The poultry industry (eggs) is expanded again. In kind cement for the floor of the industrial shed is trucked to Murrin Bridge. Daily community sports activities include volleyball, badminton, tennis, soccer and football.

Internal: Two make trip to Canberra for planning and bring Vosler back with them.

Contradiction: Maturing and expanding the structures to work through issues and arenas of responsibility. (Wk. 10)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: New stake teams, formed of auxiliary and local colleagues, spend the week recruiting showplace people to a special planning day and New Year's celebration.

Internal: Youth and Emerging Generation clear the decks for House quarter maneuvering, EG room transformation and two parties for the New Year.

Contradiction: Sustaining decision of stake team members to participate in showplace and deepening the commitment to all activities of the Human Development Project. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Village and Project timeline are seen as the same as manpower turns out for vegetable garden, school repairs, stake meetings and publishing newspaper.

Internal: Songfest at ecclesiola impacts House and guests with corporateness.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to see the cruciality of participation at every moment in the one task of building community care. (Wk. 12)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: San Francisco mission community saturation is launched with community youth leaders setting January 17 for community-wide CYF, and Mission United Presbyterian Church setting priority for two years of their mission. Orvis Agee shocks Regional Council with the four Other World symbols routed into the doors of the new kitchen cabinets he built and contributed.

Internal: Ecclesiola ends with contest for best song to Fifth City, and 16 get on the phone and sing it to Chicago House.

Contradiction: Swirling all six quarters' maneuvers at the same time. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: House sends William Rychman to HDTs from community. Local people gather to hear what HUD has to offer. Local person makes plan to open a business.

Internal: Regional Council shares story and House celebrates the new year.

Contradiction: Making the story visible that will release the "Last Fat Lady" in Cusick. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: House and Metro colleagues set-up and participate in three Development teams in three locations (45 appointments) raising \$6500 with regional target of \$1800 well in sight.

Internal: Everyone experiences being "in on" the whole thrust of Development detailed reporting, record keeping and communication in three locations.

Contradiction: Creating metro circuit implementaries to keep advantages alive and moving everywhere at once. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Morning and evening planning sessions break loose new images for how to move in a densely populated region. Two people commit themselves for a South American project.

Internal: The Jon Karpoff family claims its room and joins exquisite *Shogun* New Year's celebration.

Contradiction: Doing 12 strongholds without sacrificing experimentation needed to do one stronghold. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: House experiences the week of three firsts: first health class, first movie and first laundromat board meeting—all new structures.

Internal: House enjoys quiet New Year's Day celebration in the care of Phoenix Guardians.

Contradiction: Enabling people to make the journey into new possibility without stopping or falling off the cliff. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: In the midst of mailing Montana Report to 300, House receives 60 phone calls and has ten interviews for HDTs.

Internal: Christmas and New Year's become very discontinuous as temperature drops to -20°F.

Contradiction: Telling the ICA story strategically to overcome the unknownness block. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cafe breaks \$1,000 for month of December. Three from Cannon Ball are sent out to HDTs with full scholarships.

Internal: House hosts five residents from Minto, Alaska and Brave Bull family hosts them for fine traditional feast, after which all participate in New Year Pow-Wow.

Contradiction: Creating models to move through deficiencies. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inked wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Advent mailing continues to pay off as mail brings in further checks and promises.

Internal: Ben Parker begins internship year.

Contradiction: Maintaining public credibility for programs in midst of moving towards full employment. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Joint Regional Council with Seattle builds quarter maneuvers, quickens relationship with Cusick and brings promise of assistance from Bellingham colleagues.

Internal: House returns to full strength as Michael and Elizabeth Neat return to Canada under new employment visa.

Contradiction: Discerning the tactics that will have a multiple catalytic effect. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Team goes to Minto and sits in while entire village council decides to go to Inyan and send Clifford Alexander to HDTs for full eight weeks the next day. All transportation and per diem funding is secured from the village council and Tanana Chiefs Conference (regional association) the same day. A comprehensive file of all grads which has been "being created", is used in Christmastide mailing to 500. Village team is invited to store expansion planning.

Internal: Red book conversation for road troops and ecclesiola study are grounded in drama of community life.

Contradiction: Riding the Minto wave as a House and a movement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Final HDTs recruitment push follows Continental Council with newspaper ads and posters up around town.

Internal: Self-support maneuver has permeators working around the clock and House finishes week by joining in local church celebration with pre-Christmas meal and carols.

Contradiction: Sensing where colleagues are in their commitment in order to present the request that solicits a yes. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Christmas discontinuity is celebrated with ICA open house, Vogar Products Christmas party, and distribution of Vogar 1979 calendar.

Internal: House receives the Woodbury brothers for discontinuity and the MacIntosh and Gale families for New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Overcoming the community's general mistrust of both outside resources and other village residents. (Wk. 3)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Exciting Houston Regional Council in San Antonio has 40 colleagues and House people with many new faces from recent Texas maneuvers. Council claims victory of 60 events in four maneuvers: Alice's Restaurant, San Marcos Travelling Salvation Show, San Antonio Stroll and Huntsville Heehaw. Houston Pivot produces five CYFs, one GWF, and one LENS during December; \$18,000 developed also. New brochure is created for Quarter III Texas maneuvers.

Internal: Colleagues and House celebrate the New Year with review of last 10 years of Religious Houses and promises for 1979.

Contradiction: Engaging local people in becoming leaders in their own turf. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: HUD public hearings are scheduled for three year Small Cities EDBG. Mailing is ready to be sent out to regional colleagues. Maneuvers are written for the quarter.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration at House is preceded by dining out at a fine restaurant.

Contradiction: Beginning new quarter with full steam ahead. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Sixty people attend *Posada* at House. Quarter plan is built, with emphasis on stake visiting to broaden participation in guilds.

Internal: Everyone returns from discontinuity except Jose Griego who goes to Chicago for HDTs.

Contradiction: Securing participation in the second quarterly town assembly. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House winds up one maneuver and begins another with Burkburnett TM (Cleburne, Texas) and mailing of quarter calendar to Oklahoma City metro colleagues.

Internal: The House completes facility set-up with opening of guest space in refurbished garage.

Contradiction: Welding all the troops and tasks into one thrust through structural continuity. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: The West Central Texas Council of Governments requests the ICA's help in doing 56 TMs. HDTs marketing continues. The global slide show is shown at the Dallas Black Chamber of Commerce. A committee of eight distinguished citizens is established for TM in north Texas.

Internal: An in-House TM plans Quarter III with sensational maneuvers.

Contradiction: Changing the image that ice in the Sunbelt slows down human development. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Sixty TMs are scheduled through the mail and by phone. A public hearing concerning the CD Block Grant proposal is held. The year's report of DPCA activities is given by Gail Towers and is used as a context for the election of two new members to its Board. The preschool signs contract for next quarter as 45 others close across the state. One is sent to HDTS from Freedom Village (where a Delta Days TM is held) with DPCA scholarship for travel. Laundromat closes December books with \$340 profit. New Year's Eve dinner is held with 15 present from the community, the high point being individual and corporate resolve relative to the new year and neighboring communities.

Internal: Panchayat visit enlightens task for the next two quarters toward completion and the necessity of these visits in preparation for July.

Contradiction: Articulating a clear corporate image relative to style and stance in the next quarter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Three from House attend Mississippi maneuver planning where the whole sector actualizes its commitment to intensify the maneuver with twice the events in half the time.

Internal: Extended family members heighten Christmas celebration and enable great day of painting the House.

Contradiction: Forging one thrust for the quarter in the midst of broad complex commitments and scattered troops. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Memphis-New Orleans Regional Council meets in Delta Pace and revises model for completion of Mississippi 200, administered out of ICA office in Jackson, Mississippi. Memphis and Delta Pace combine efforts to send one participant to HDTS in 5th City and more possibilities in the works.

Internal: House joins Delta Pace community at new, soon-to-be-opened Pace Restaurant for New Year's Eve celebration where toasts to HDP completion are accompanied by shotgun blasts heralding 1979.

Contradiction: Building consensus with half the House on the road. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Framing works as first round of ten appointments yields new inroads and CYF in Decatur girls club.

Internal: New internal life model is implemented with collegiums on framing, permeation, and Tuesday night readings from *The Wizard of Earth-Sea*.

Contradiction: Solidifying signal maneuver events to build base for story and funding. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Over 100 people attend community Christmas celebration, with all denominations, ages, stakes and races represented. Event symbolizes the six-month journey of community corporateness.

Internal: New Year's Eve at the Bingham's house in Raleigh begins with a seven-course French dinner, including caviar, five wines and chocolate mousse, and ends with the Common Meal at 2:00 a.m.

Contradiction: Putting together the plans for the next six months. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Two splendid CYFs with selected students from local high schools and two TMs conclude a successful Big O Maneuver in Orange County and Orlando. Development team presence gives a "big House" feel to the week making a Rotary Club presentation in Eustice which holds much promise for the future.

Internal: Celebration of the week is an all-day-and-into-the-evening, mostly-free-courtesy-of-a-colleague Disneyworld trip.

Contradiction: Sorting out details, filing information and reports and regrouping for the next push. (Wk. 1)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Twenty participants at HDTS are there as a result of the newspaper ads. Operations hammers out victories of the campaigns this quarter. Development circuits are sent out on two-week trips. Accounts are prepared for auditors.

Internal: Nexus builds Tuesday night cleaning blitz into timeline to shift into Epiphany.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between theory and action. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Miracles are seen throughout the week at the Community Center and administration building as colleagues from many communities work together. House develops \$10,000 toward the million dollar victory. Several Fifth citizens meet several times over concern of community's attendance at meetings. Fifth City housing staff handles replacement of boiler in apartment building. Preschool handles contract revocation and IRS. A bright reception and administration area is created with help of many colleagues from Richgrove and Milwaukee.

Internal: House celebrates new year with table games, fine decor, food and drink, and is particularly captured by remote-controlled TV games.

Contradiction: Configuring House to permit HDTS to be an asset to the quarter task. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Friday night Festival of Lights launches Christmas season with great success. Lights on 110-foot water tower, Snow King and Queen (senior citizens), a Christmas mall (flea market), and a procession down Main Street are highlights of the evening. Over 300 people participate even though it takes place during an ice storm. The *Des Moines Register* picks Lorimor for a December 24 special story on small town community Christmas celebrations. They will be in town several more times during the month. Three TMs are held near Lorimor, and \$3,000 is received from Hy Vee Foods.

Internal: Geoff Nixon has most successful Development week of the quarter (\$11,000 in hand) and picks up surplus desks for the Development office.

Contradiction: Using Christmas momentum to solidly launch next quarter. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: With the House discontinuous, Pamela Blood goes to the airport to launch Bill Huston, a new colleague from St. Joseph, Missouri, on his way to India to help introduce the three-wheel TRAG as a transportation-agricultural vehicle.

Internal: Due to Sunday's snowstorm, New Year's Eve is celebrated again on Monday evening with a progressive dinner beginning in the Belin's apartment on the third floor, then the Loeppke's apartment on the second, then the House on the main floor.

Contradiction: Trying innovative new things when you can hardly do the demands of the day. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development week consumes all in the House with raising monies as the Minneapolis Region Christmas gift to the world. Two thousand dollars is raised over and above the miraculous million bottom line of \$6,000.

Internal: "Santa's Elves" gather with caps on in the evenings to reflect on the day's victories and celebrate with wine and song each night of the Development week.

Contradiction: Defining and placing ourselves on the death ground that will insure victories for the Kinney HDP and regional saturation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: House makes key contacts in coal country stronghold with those who care in Missouri State Community Betterment, Extension Services, and Continental Telephone.

Internal: Regional quarter calendar of events is created in midst of 24-hour New Year celebration.

Contradiction: Waiting for gel to set. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: First Mill Shoals Business and Services Directory is sent to 330 households. Bob and Jannie Dunlap are sent to the HDS in Chicago with salary and tuition fully funded by CETA.

Internal: Linda Zahrt braves 10 inches of snow to St. Louis to learn TM set-up method.

Contradiction: Structuring guild activity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Hope for first hockey team in six years becomes visible as workday completes renovated warming house and skating rink in -20°F weather. Thirty-three youth attend "Sunday Night at the Movies."

Internal: Eleven-foot Christmas tree, cut from woods, is trimmed to cap off Advent House decorating.

Contradiction: Communicating the importance of outside-the-Project trips, or how an HDP is different from self-help. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Development team raises money, HDS prospects and new approaches to stronghold strategy.

Internal: Double study of John Dunne at ecclesiola and following morning's collegium reveals life-giving method that Dunne created.

Contradiction: Effectively announcing HDS to people who are in transition and searching for options. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: New year gets off to a great start with a New Year's Eve council and celebration for 25 House and bi-metro colleagues. House sends one Hoosier to HDS and interviews another for Minto Consult. Indianapolis decides to add a meeting after House Church each Sunday to create more time for missional planning. Check for \$200 appears from Development call of six weeks ago.

Internal: Janis Johnston becomes one of two people in the judicial branch who hangs on to her job as the Republicans take over in Marion County politics.

Contradiction: Getting the quarter on paper in a way that releases the cadres to move with power. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House launches two new metro cadres, secures 20 Guardian commitments to attend Panchayat event, and sends two to HDS.

Internal: House secures new job for \$12,500 and completes maneuver planning for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Planning the Panchayat visit as key to launching Quarter III maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Panchayat and House host two events—a guild meeting where regional framing is begun, and a meeting for clergy and lay who participated in Detroit saturation to discuss the role of the Church in the urban community.

Internal: Sixteen colleagues get involved as House readies and moves into free 16-room facility in one explosive week in time to receive Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Expanding the Guardian/patron base. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Ten metro colleagues plan for Quarter III Metro Council with House, and decide that the morning reporting session will write and publish a newsletter with features on Quarter II accomplishments.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 50 attending is highlighted by TM and GSD game, including three moves ahead for proper framing and two moves back for funding proposal failure.

Contradiction: Getting the three-year stronghold timeline, which is in everyone's mind, onto the wall. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The New York Region prepares for the new year with a battleplan session on the last day of 1978 and devises a tactical system for Quarter III that will enable House to pull off 12 strongholds.

Internal: The *Milagro Beanfield War* sets the context for the New Year's celebration with visits from the Guardian angel of the past year.

Contradiction: Operating out of the quarter's stated priorities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Preparation for new quarter is climaxed by workshops with David Dunn from area Development.

Internal: Brian May and Linda Brock bring fresh vitality to House as they begin new assignment here.

Contradiction: Laying the groundwork in the midst of building the superstructure. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: House engages in intensive week of telephoning in preparation for regional training event for GWF and ECF in conjunction with Regional Council and to recruit participants for the HDS.

Internal: Week of polishing the Religious House includes waxing floors and polishing furniture in preparation for Regional Council. Work is celebrated with trimming the Christmas tree at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating models which will engage those newly trained in the set-up of GWF. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Profound Humanness in the form of event "happens" to Ivy City all week as three days of community Thanksgiving feast preparation peaks Tuesday night prior to Wednesday night feast, and unanticipated community residents join in to help create a fantastic regional celebration.

Internal: House breaks through the events of the week to the profoundness of celebration, shifting the focus from the event to the collegiality surrounding the event.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops and assigning generalship roles and tasks to ensure the victory. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Fine 4-H meeting is held. Pallet contract is nearly completed.

Internal: House experiences the power of corporateness to overcome terror and a caring community during assistance to three broken arms and a wrecked car.

Contradiction: Remaneuvering to deal with no car. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: North Philadelphia stronghold reaffirms its commitment to local man by sending a local resident to the HDTs and immediately turning over \$50 toward tuition.

Internal: House is addressed by the number of past contacts who call up to ask if House is still around and then demand that they be put on mailing list.

Contradiction: Concretizing the practical implications of doing all 12 strongholds at once. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: The Morristown stronghold has moved itself into the sustaining phase on the backs on New Jersey colleagues, who continue to set up CYFs with Jaycees and work with groups in Dover on several forums.

Internal: Quarter III's tactical system is complete with intensified efforts in Lower Manhattan and a demonstration actuation in Smithtown, Long Island.

Contradiction: Operating out of this quarter's stated priorities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Day of regional planning and night of celebrating the New Year's arrival cements a common operating strategy committed to saturation stronghold and HDP victory.

Internal: House experiences corporate self-reflection and discovery of new articulations of who ICA is (as a result of attacks by the press).

Contradiction: Finding new points of leverage with a constantly changing fulcrum. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Letter previewing 1979 and detailing Quarter III events and activities is sent to 50 colleagues, with a request for scheduling in assistance now. House receives two new pledges.

Internal: The entire region celebrates the new year with a New Year's Eve saturation phasing/planning day and then with the City of Boston on "First Night"—free concerts, drama and fireworks.

Contradiction: Securing the yes early from colleagues to enable participation and effective program wins. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Project meeting decides that local people will present the firewood business proposal to meeting with other community people, and help prepare for presentation. Model of firewood cutter-splitter generates much interest.

Internal: The completion of the first phase of House renovation is celebrated with an Open House and releases auxiliary's attention for other things, including self-support.

Contradiction: Telling a winning story that sustains auxiliary and core supporters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two strongholds are launched: Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, and Brockton, Massachusetts, with first date set.

Internal: Press release catalyzes House to rehearse El-ICA history and self-story.

Contradiction: Creating stronghold time design to release effective use of troops. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Quarter is off to a fine start in all arenas as \$25,000 check is picked up for global Development (making \$27,500 for week). Area Council produces team of 10 permeators and time line is created for Montreal GWF.

Internal: Quarter III Area Council meets in two locations with Emerging Generation structure, "The Chosen in '79," held in new rent-free facility.

Contradiction: Building strategy in midst of House moving. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House focuses on HDTs recruitment through religious orders and newspaper ad.

Internal: House celebrates third week of Advent tidings of great joy with cutting of Christmas tree and going to a performance of Handel's *Messiah*.

Contradiction: Getting hold of a broad frame of authorization and networks to do saturation in Halton Region and municipality. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: House moves on troop contradiction by wrapping up two to HDTs in Chicago and two sojourners for the House mid-January.

Internal: New Year's party with area in Montreal captures all in *Auberge fantaisie* and sends House into quarter with global collegiality.

Contradiction: Re-imaging House self-sufficiency to catalyze movemental colleagues and acceleration of the mission. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Cadre of *Treize Gaspesiens* saturation begins strategizing polis forums' followup. Dieppe saturation is full speed ahead through collaboration with city recreation department.

Internal: House sends half of staff to self-support in city 200 miles away.

Contradiction: Stimulating community to pick up roles formerly carried out by the ICA, especially funding and capital development. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Cano Negro begins the "Year of Independence" with community taking responsibility for raising its own salaries. Caracas cadre celebrates New Year's on the 29th and claims hopes and dreams for 1979.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebrated with a community *bolos criollas* game, dinner at favorite restaurant and a serenade through community.

Contradiction: Getting community to assume responsibility for administration of finances. (Wk. 3)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: House makes increasing use of community resources: local transportation for bakery supplies, local clubs to make decor, and many Christmas songs for the songbook. All of these are used to bring off children's program on the 23rd and party Christmas night.

Internal: Groups return from Continental Council and Brazilian exchange.

Contradiction: Organizing time for reflection and analysis of the state of the Project. (Wk. 2)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: New community post office is inaugurated, complete with firecrackers, speeches and local politicians. The week focuses on the opening of the bakery with bakery painting and equipment construction, a trip to Silva Jardim with the four community bakers to learn to bake bread, and the community's eating the first product—a cake—at the community meeting. Bananeiras graduates 18 from preschool with all families present at the graduation. Development comes through with 92,000 cruzeiros (US\$5,000). Thirteen boxes of zucchini are harvested and cucumbers are coming.

Internal: Raul and Jose' cook a fine Chilean feast for the auxiliary and are sent out the following Tuesday with a champagne breakfast.

Contradiction: Focusing next quarter's activities on economic, agriculture and health miracles, while riding the wave of increased community participation. (Wk. 3)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Michaelina Young and Mary Kuhajetz arrive from Milwaukee to lead a health trek that produces 346 examinations and a health mural for the plaza. Two Guatemalan bakers train local Panaderia troops to be the best in the business—and the product proves it. The local mayor and community leaders announce electrifying news: the pre-payments are complete and the installation of lights can begin!

Internal: Fernando Campos, Consuelo de Leon, George and Rose West are sent out to the Latin American Council in Caracas.

Contradiction: Orchestrating victories to create more motivity to release more victories to create more motivity, etc. (Wk. 2)

WEEK THREE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a workshop in Hong Kong on all the circuits for quarter gives comprehensive input to planning images and illuminates the related flow of actions required to insure victory in all arenas. Chicago shifts team assignments, creates the new story, brainstorms new decor, while all 36 Houses are visited, and remaneuver for Quarter III. A German church sends in \$3,500 from its Christmas bazaar. Marists in Brussels come through with \$1,200 at a week's notice on first contact. The quarter is launched with planning PSU, the ability to shift to new mood of 1979 with new quarter images and a new decision toward aggressive public images including global bank of materials. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pushing insights on the new dimensions of responsibility to the practical forms needed to insure implementation of Quarter III Development maneuver.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the master image for the Centrum this week is the launching of new systems towards the actuation of the quarter's maneuvers. The creation of Phase I curriculum constructs, the new year-long Journal quickly moving to the lay-out and production stages, and the impact of a new practical application of the work of Research—especially in the arena of the HDTs—all point to a new edge of Research as engagement. Work continues on the retreat, Academy recruitment, anticipating further experimentation with the modules, and the creation of the impact framework for the global film. The emerging task of documentation of the work of three campaigns throws Research into new experimentation with cross-centrum configurations in order to forge new vessels to freight global mythology. The key contradiction lies in the arena of clarifying the practical context which holds the urgency of the quarter's task in tension with the futuric visioning which is the Order's life blood.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports 36 more villages launched in Maharashtra, bringing the total to 102. January Maharashtra maneuvers include an 80-person strike force to accelerate the six keystone villages while maintaining the discipline of the circuits and the preparation for 60 Consults—February 26 through March 26. HDTs: Fifth City is launched in the renovated community center, while preparations for CTC Australia proceed with vigor, and ICA staff are warmly received at the World Council of Churches central committee meeting in Jamaica. Maharashtra circuits and the Philippine cluster experiment point the way to accelerated expansion and the clear possibility of the 2500. The key contradiction lies in the arena of weak reconnaissance systems supplying insufficient field data to launch the quarter with the bang the new year requires, and slowing the building of centrum maneuvers.

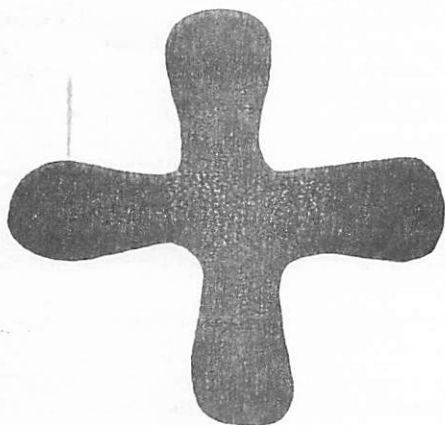
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that Brussels is excited about administering a 189,310 British pound grant from EEC to the ICA Charitable Trust. Management Centrum will prepare and enable visa work for colleagues in India. Chicago does major plumbing for bathrooms, repairs on lighting, and floor re-tiling in Fifth City community center, and in-kind of 20,000 disposable place settings for HDTs. There is a new field confidence of management systems. The key contradiction lies in the arena of doing the now, taking care of the past while pushing out beyond.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: British American Tobacco says yes to doing demonstration LENS with managing directors of subsidiary companies. Texaco gives \$1,000, their third annual gift. Two religious orders give cash in hand, several others committed, and 250 orders still to go. Electrical work is completed in vehicle section of Powerhouse during international workday.

Internal: Greg Farley family visits, helps with Powerhouse, and talks about their anticipated trip/internship in El Bayad.

Contradiction: Bringing off maneuvers while administrative functions expand in the wake of new breakthroughs. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Development calls continue to be a spark as Honeywell call is a highlight. Brother Ogilvie, of the Marist Brothers and head of a secondary school, gives possibilities of two CYFs. A long-time colleague signs seven-year pledge equal to \$2200.

Internal: Tai'rgwaith colleagues on discontinuity get snowed in and spend *pukka* Scottish New Year in Glasgow.

Contradiction: Permitting flexibility for rapid maneuvering in midst of horrific transportation situation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Management Board builds their capital funding timeline and community women build their model for sewing industry, while 50 Guardians receive their Christmas cards and last quarter's TMs breakdown impact event possibilities.

Internal: One hundred twenty-eight pound salary check comes in as House returns from exciting Area Council in Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Forming community consensus about use of community space. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two Forum Communautaires are set through contacts with two different bishops (Ageu and Mantauban).

Internal: Maneuvers written allows House to name the death ground/victories on many fronts.

Contradiction: Spinning the second polis while establishing a firm ground of Development. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: After months of negotiating, the municipality finally gathers a quorum for a council meeting and approves five-year rent-free facility for cooperative industry. Payment of \$3,000 for 36 beach umbrellas arrives from Atlanta and women are paid. Youth gather at House on Christmas Eve.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with roast rabbit in Rome, sends Sheila to England for discontinuity, and welcomes Bob Rand for Development.

Contradiction: Picking up local man after he has won and enabling him to move to the next step. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Enugu Circuit returns with reports of three TMs held in Igbo Ukwu, all with proposals to start fish farms and small industry. Mr. Sanni returns as a man of iron, an experienced TM

orchestrator, and a miracle story in himself. Hot on the circuit's heels, Mr. Unedike, of Nigerfarms Ltd., rolls in for a site visit, and invites ICA to send him two staff immediately to start an HDP in eastern village. The week of incredible visits is capped when the President of the "Progressive Society", an Ijebu-based Lagos organization, drops by during Sunday House planning meeting to request assistance in arranging a bulldozer for the clearing of land for the new primary school, and ends up volunteering three people to come on the in-kind calls.

Internal: Visits to the Project by Paul Schrijnen (on his way to the CYF trek), Sisters Bernadette and Monica of the Holy Child Sisters, and six Anglican diocese officials, including the Bishop Akintembe and Archdeacon Ajayi, symbolize the presence of the ecumenical religious.

Contradiction: Moving in the fog of legality in building the sewing factory without running into a tree. (Wk. 3)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus plans treks to Termine and Isle of Dogs for HDP showpiece acceleration.

Internal: Nexus welcomes back Brian Williams and Doris Hahn from Nairobi council and hears reports of Africa and NAME.

Contradiction: Orchestrating image of Quarter III with deployment already begun for quarter. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Wallonia circuit nets three Town Meetings in worst snow yet this winter. CYF in saturation target area has local workshop leaders.

Internal: A week of powerful collegiums and a fine ecclesiola atmosphere sets the mood.

Contradiction: Breaking Town Meetings loose on a timeline that wins whole war and not isolated battles. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Area Council produces geography-oriented maneuvers, creating new corporateness in going for broke on TM in the Benelux. CYF trek of Paul Schrijnen to Nigeria produces over \$500 in developed travel monies.

Internal: House moves out of present facility and into colleagues' homes as first step in self-support maneuver.

Contradiction: Deciding the symbol of victory that will sustain House on the road in finding a new facility quickly. (Wk. 4)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Twenty-two authorization figures are invited to be identified as ICA Germany's advisors. Quarterly newsletter is put together under new title, *Courage For the Future*—taking its name from the title of the half-hour documentary on Kreuzberg Ost HDP shown on German television on New Year's.

Internal: Golda family is given residence permit easily and cheerfully after ICA identity with Kreuzberg Ost Project ala television show.

Contradiction: Plugging gaps in authorization in way that enables the TM campaign rather than as a separate and extra task. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Two community people attend USA Ambassador Stoessel's New Year's Day open house. Community person also gives presentation on Project at Hamburg church. Reflection on New Year's Eve party reveals need for someone to

orchestrate a celebrative event. Development for December tops 4,000 Deutsche marks.

Internal: House attends theater play of *Cabaret* and has image-blowing conversation on history of Germany.

Contradiction: Creating new vision for community. (Wk. 3)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Enthusiastic Kapini youth (12-20) gather for Saturday CYF and make plans for launching youth club. Three huge bulldozers transform Kapini HDP space as new roads, bridge and Kayosha River spillway are created just as rains begin. Five graduated farm trainees start five weeks of training in poultry at government farm. Commerce and industry push ahead as Guardian catalyzes new roofing industry, following successful research with flour bags and cement. Thirty bags of wool arrive for spinning industry, and general store is daily supplied with basic foodstuffs such as bread, sugar and milk. Community workday stomping at the primary school foundation is made easy with local songs.

Internal: Walter Nkana, commerce and industry gun, begins intern year.

Contradiction: Increasing community leadership and participation to keep up with Project development spiraling. (Wk. 11)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The water tank, beautifully painted with the grid and phrase, "Water is the life of Bayad," is raised to the top of the water tower by a crane contributed for the day.

Internal: House celebrates Western and Eastern Christmas with staggered discontinuities to visit Egypt and two great Christmas feasts.

Contradiction: Building on the excitement of the water system victory to intensify Bayad leadership. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: KAWATAX, the sewing industry, is launched with contract of mattress covers to be done in three weeks. Village tailors bring machines to industry as work begins. HCT weighs 28 babies in focus stake. Czech co-op representative visits Kawangware and is excited by Co-op and offended by mud. Fantastic hosting is done by Co-op Chairman, Charles Kimocho, who particularly impresses the man with the scope of the Co-op and the role of the ICA. Farmers and Boivin spend day visiting the fish farm. Assistant Chief of Kawangware, Mr. Kibe, walks four miles with VM team to find he must recruit the meeting, then brings tea and pork for celebration. In three workdays Stakes 4 and 5 put up bulletin boards and Stake 2 finishes new drainage ditch. Two light poles are inked for huge lamp that will light up the whole square and market.

Internal: Meg Wildhack returns to Kawangware as she awaits word from Kapini, her destination.

Contradiction: Enabling structures to build comprehensive models that implement timelines. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Workday marks first progress in dam-building in Kamweleni in 23 years, and draws 39 participants with representation from each stake and from the nearby village of Mulindi. The building of 43 washstops in one day lays groundwork in soil conservation which must be initiated before the government will authorize the building of a dam. Nairobi

Development call shows that a successful community developer does not have to speak English or be literate. Community leadership increases as stake leaders visit every stake with auxiliary and most stakes assume responsibility to install their own call bells for stake meetings.

Internal: Augustine Hajega returns from week of site selection and Village Meetings in the coast province.

Contradiction: Enabling auxiliary to demonstrate the corporate style necessary to catalyze Iron Men in Kamweleni. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Project Directors' Meeting is held at Maliwada with 150 Directors and support forces from 45 Projects.

Internal: The race goes on between the monsoon rains and the repair of the roof on the auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Getting a clear story on the role of the Maliwada HDP in relation to all of the Nava Gram Prayas, the HDTs and the Nexus. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Sikroar HDP (Delhi) is launched with villagers, government officials, six villagers from Maharashtra Projects and sponsor Mr. Lal of Eicher Tractors.

Internal: House welcomes Judy Montgomery and Manuel Guillot to current round of NGP Consults and Pandit and Naneshor from Maliwada in Bombay to participate in MSSIDC (Maharashtra State Small Industries Development Corporation) exhibition selling silver jewelry and ornaments from the Project.

Contradiction: Creating the do-ment in an increasing number of villages that will sweep all Project villages into development with an average of 2.6 staff per Project in 100 Projects. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROAR HDP

External: Gram Sabha held in Sikroar with 100 adults, followed by a film show for 350, announces the Consult amid growing excitement. Kuldip Narang, Eicher Tractors and Ghaziabad Inner Wheel offer Project support.

Internal: Jaya and Marcus Salve join the auxiliary, and Robert Yallop joins in the Development effort.

Contradiction: Breaking loose auxiliary and consultant housing. (Wk. 12)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is re-vamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Buffer Project trek returns to Calcutta after breaking open new possibilities for company sponsorship and visiting key colleagues in Ranchi, Patna and Jamshedpur, who will serve as entrees to public and private support. December maneuvers are built on other side of trek.

Internal: Large wall calendar of December "eventfulness" holds House over against victory circle for the month.

Contradiction: Empowering the buffer HDP story rapidly to serve the Consult, which is but two months away. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: All centrum bands participate in Singapore Area Council also attended by many national auxiliaries participating in the council dynamic for the first time. Centrum finds itself involved in two areas and four nations during Week 1.

Internal: Arrival of Wedge team to Area Singapore for fundamental authorization and maneuver building celebrates week with great feast in Singapore City's famous food stalls.

Contradiction: Catalyzing leadership of campaigns without constant presence of centrum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Visit to District Office to check on Chief Minister's visit scheduled January 8th reveals a committee has been formed at ministry level to include District Office and ICA staff to make sure CM visit is successful. "If Project doesn't come off, we will all look bad," says Assistant to Minister of Industrial and Rural Development.

Internal: Staff begins discontinuity, but keeps working relative to CM visit in two weeks and enjoys invitations to open houses at all levels over holidays.

Contradiction: Deciding the death ground after the Chief Minister's visit that will launch the new orbit of community involvement and commitment. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGLAI LUI

External: Both Mara Committee of 16 and Stake Meeting are led by villagers with real professionalism. Stake 4 decides to again hold English classes, but to insure its continuance, assigns three youth to teach and auxiliary to aid them in writing curriculum. Twenty-one farmers meet and organize scheduling for two rented kabotas. Appointment with the Deputy Minister of Education holds unexpected surprise with presence of the Directors of Education for both the Sabah and Sarawak.

Internal: Program phasing workshop gives clear picture of where Project is and what thrust is next.

Contradiction: Moving all stakes along toward self-reliance. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Construction begins on fifth chicken house, giving one per stake. Daily village leadership training begins. International Nickel visits. Villagers name the three villages (Nurdin, Asam, Dahung) *Nurada*—which means "light exists". A new song, *Nurada*, is written in stake meeting to symbolize the new name. The Governor sends a letter to local and central government directing government support for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Alice Wright after assisting with USAID proposal writing in Jakarta, is sent out to Medan to participate in GCF at University of North Sumatra.

Contradiction: Operating out of the new images and structures necessary to give form to the new spirit breakloose. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: New dimensions of activity and local decisions of community responsibility are realized as new Camat visits and talks on development, GCF Bubun rearticulates vision and struggles with challenges and proposals, and five villagers attend Kwala Langkat GCF as preparation for becoming leaders. Books are donated for library and English classes, village committee (LSD) decides profits from oil sales in Bubun go to social programs (preschool salaries), and drama becomes part of preschool and English curriculum.

Internal: Whole new face and form of auxiliary emerges as all train, train, train and then pull off two great GCFs. Eleven staff and two babies go by fishing boat, returning in time for breakfast the next day. Andrew Jeffries from Australia adds drama to ecclesiola and auxiliary celebration picnic.

Contradiction: Holding perspective of Project over against two weeks of very little income with two more weeks expected. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: An educational survey is printed and completed, with statistics obtained of every house in the village. The statistics are entered on the newly hung statistics board and a picture of the educational patterns in the community are emerging. The victory is celebrated with a pesta (party) with all enjoying kue (local delicacy of cake). The *Signs of the Future Maneuver* is changing the looks of the village with the community center sign up, and signs for the preschool, repair shop, and retail shops in the making. (Wk. 4)

Internal: Area Council attendees return with news of area maneuvers and a picture of what the coming quarter will look like.

Contradiction: Involving villagers in external mission in the midst of their busy planting time. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Tony Elizondo is sent out to first Philippine cluster Consult. Development holds week-long PSU to pull together quarter's plans.

Internal: New Year's Day barbeque at a Guardian's home starts the year off with a feast.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on opportunity for new future directions in band encounters this quarter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Furama Hotel sponsors Guardian meeting for all who have worked on the land development of the Nam Wai Foundation. Panchayat and Jay Antenen also participate with global images to deepen the intense care of Guardians. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco promise substantial support for Project in fine Development call. Ten students from International School address villagers with their enthusiasm for concrete and paint, catalyzing many suggestions about visible improvements. Twenty new members receive library cards as newsletter is distributed.

Internal: The visit of the Panchayat gives all a start on the reflections needed in order to create next year's strategies. House holds quarterly celebration and receives Carl Hickey from Japan.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on needs in the community around which elders and youth can be engaged. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Reporting visits made to 17 past contributors to Project reveals excitement about Project progress and openness to future contributions. Youth of 4—H Club plant vegetable garden for preschool lunch program and flower garden for village beautification.

Internal: Traditional Thanksgiving feast is followed by evening of "talking turkey" with colleagues from Taipei and Hong Kong Development Centrum.

Contradiction: Broadening individual engagement in the village where they are ready to engage. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Meeting with national YMCA staff sets stage for second wave of GCFs covering the Philippines. Multi-national supporters are blitzed with personalized gifts of Sudtonggan abbaca craft and Sudtonggan HDP photograph.

Internal: Week of Christmas celebration meals with parish people is capped by New Year's House meeting and celebration at Manila Peninsula.

Contradiction: Creating a metamorphoses in sustaining models to make "the leap." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: ICA Taiwan's financial ledgers and books are submitted to audit company covering entire operation of ICA in Taipei and Hai Ou HDP. New Year's mailing announcing the next Philippine HDTs are sent out to 200 colleagues, friends and supporters of ICA's task in Taiwan. As of December 31, Quarter II Development income for Taipei and Kaohsiung is US\$8,850.

Internal: Quarter III planning session reveals six maneuver arenas: Development, authorization, management, troops, Taiwan circuits, and Hai Ou HDP situation.

Contradiction: Creating adequate corporate self-story and images to launch Taiwan circuits in twelve metros for the "Taiwan Gold" campaign. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Fifty-four consultants (32 blue shirts) hit San Miguel and in first three days transform village in preparation for three day Consult. Consult closing feast finds whole village in attendance with decision to complete two-thirds of the subtasks by May 1. The dramatic closing of the feast includes the send-out of the 20 most powerful San Miguel leaders for three weeks to assist the next three villages in their Consults—an incredible sign of detachment and decision to be cluster. In the meantime, up to three bus loads of tourists a day are touring Sudtonggan and craft display, intensifying the industry teams of the Consults.

Internal: Ken and Judy Hamje, Carl Hickey, Roger Lindahl, Tony Elizondo arrive for cluster Consults.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythms of corporate life while living two months of discontinuity. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Sewing industry gets wholesale material from Manila and begins mass production of kimonos. Biggest department store in Davao shows interest and orders samples of clothing items. Section II of training center is completed and work begins on Section III which will be the sewing industry section. Preschool takes field trip to Coke plant.

Internal: House completes move into training center just as old house begins to fall down. Potot children arrive from Sudtonggan, bringing total Emerging Generation to 16.

Contradiction: Creating the long-range community plans. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Traditional Japanese week-long New Year holiday closes everything. House works on outline of two-year TM: Japan campaign, 1000 Meetings, or 20 per prefecture. New Year's letter to Japanese Houses stresses "now is the time".

Internal: House joins thousands for visit to Emperor's palace on January 2nd; Emperor and family wave to the crowds as he begins the 54th year of his reign.

Contradiction: Standing before the kairotic moment while bumping into the time-consuming step-by-step manner in which things happen. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Voting by 90.5% of villagers in national elections to choose two assembly men from Jeju-Do is accomplished. Hur Myung Hee goes to Area Council and new assignment in Oyubari. Lee Joe Joon and James Bell attend Area Council in Osaka.

Internal: Many students visit requesting period of sojourn during long winter holiday (two months) from university, and Mr. Kim Cho Hyun begins sojourn.

Contradiction: Ensuring corporate weekly meetings of village and auxiliary to build and actuate plans. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House begins tertiary maneuver setting up two of eight TMs in Fukuoka. Preparation for the February maneuver begins with wins on every front.

Internal: House begins the year by celebrating two birthdays in mid-second phase (MacKay and Ziegenmier), and sees some magic acts.

Contradiction: Preventing the local calendar from undercutting House momentum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Development is off to a great start in the new year with a breakthrough chart of two years of Osaka Development, the organization and sending of thank you's, receipts, and certificates, and the deposit of 275,500 yen (US\$1,450).

Internal: A full week of celebration includes New Year's Day brunch and workday, Sushila Joshi's send-out to Hong Kong for visa work, and wine toasts to new permeation at 100,000 yen for two weeks' work, two hours a day.

Contradiction: Demonstrating that the tools and methods win (space design, timeline, priorities, etc.). (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Full week on all fronts includes an extended conversation with city officials which clarifies the initial phases of a new Oyubari clinic, another prefecture preparing to turn gold with circuit to Sendai, and Regional Council of 30 which brings together business and academic Guardians with youthful circuiters for five full hours of vigorous planning.

Internal: House welcomes two new sojourn families—Mrs. Sato and two children and Miss Kazue Okuda, recent CYF graduate.

Contradiction: Broadening the vision beyond the limits of a two-year campaign. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: House sets 12 appointments with companies for major funding and ties down four registrations for Summer (CTC).

Internal: House sends out youth to families for summer vacations and teams to Melbourne and Adelaide for Development. Weygandt family arrives for new assignment and immediately experience work party Week II at Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Encompassing the shift from authorization to decisively acting from death ground to bring off the programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Waiting and waitressing at Christmas dinner for family of Perth millionaire nets \$100 tip for sustenance coffers.

Internal: House sends Karen and John to Community Training Consultation in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Hanging ten while the external situation pushes House to hang fire. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBURGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Murrin Bridge HDP painting party is joined by Adelaide with three regional people and two House members. Weekly CTC (Community Training Consultation) regional planning meeting is located at Immanuel College. A \$1,000 anonymous gift for CTC scholarships is received. Regional mailings of Oomburgurri evaluation are completed.

Internal: One more job is obtained in Adelaide Fiscal Feat (\$2,000 in two months), gaining \$100 in first four days.

Contradiction: Igniting another burner of CTC recruitment tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Whirlwind circuits to Geelong, Yarraglen and Lakes Entrance plus \$1,250 in-hand for CTC scholarships enable ten to attend summer programs in Adelaide.

Internal: Midnight House Church (Auckland time) and New Year's Day planning set January priorities and launch new year.

Contradiction: Continuing to use discontinuous time to set stage for 1979. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Two months intensive authorization push ends with winning call to Sir John Crawford, top World Bank Advisor for funding for India, advisor to CIDA, and advisor to Australian Prime Minister. Sir John promises to visit Malwada early in February. On the same day, Federal Department of Health invites House back, after having said no salaries for Murrin Bridge HDP, to talk again, and this time helps to write proposals for direct grant to ICA.

Internal: House receives Sisters Betty McGee and Janet Hughes to talk over getting authorization from their order to work in Latin America for two years, beginning late 1979.

Contradiction: Following up authorization calls and proposals, and getting industry (vegetables for canning) into Murrin Bridge all at once. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Two CMAs are held and Crow's Nest core meeting sets a date in February. Development proposals follow-up and 10 appointments with new prospects begin to open doors.

Internal: House yard is transformed with the use of a sickle to tear away overhanging trees and five-foot-high weeds, revealing undiscovered garden plants.

Contradiction: Allowing the region to be engaged now while building the story around next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: The poultry industry (eggs) is expanded again. Ink cement for the floor of the industrial shed is trucked to Murrin Bridge. Daily community sports activities include volleyball, badminton, tennis, soccer and football.

Internal: Two make trip to Canberra for planning and bring Vosler back with them.

Contradiction: Maturing and expanding the structures to work through issues and arenas of responsibility. (Wk. 10)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: House launches the quarter with a montage of meetings, celebrations and activities which re-engage some old colleagues and engage many new ones. Activities include a planning day for the showplace, a one year birthday party (Kemem) and New Year's celebration.

Internal: The House experiences the first week with a new time design that includes two evening meals with community colleagues, Wednesday Family Night, and Sunday morning House Church.

Contradiction: Swirling momentum from excitement and vision into commitment to do maneuvers. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: In Apia the Salani Voice is mailed to various places in South Pacific as first proposals are submitted to New Zealand and *International Year of the Child*. In the midst of visitors for the church dedication, Salani activities include gardens weeded, a section of the pathway upgraded, a demonstration cement shower slab built, preparations for five water sealed toilets and the beach cleaned.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with first combined village church service leads into a day of internal planning and the rehearsal of the how's and why's of symbolic life.

Contradiction: Enabling corporate village activities in the midst of frantic individual family preparation for the church celebration. (Wk. 4)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: San Francisco mission community saturation is launched with community youth leaders setting January 17 for community-wide CYF, and Mission United Presbyterian Church setting priority for two years of their mission. Orvis Agee shocks Regional Council with the four Other World symbols routed into the doors of the new kitchen cabinets he built and contributed.

Internal: Ecclesiola ends with contest for best song to Fifth City, and 16 get on the phone and sing it to Chicago House.

Contradiction: Swirling all six quarters' maneuvers at the same time. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: All five neighborhoods meet on same night with record attendance to kick off HUD housing grant input from every household. Thirty people gather for potluck and games party to celebrate Ruth Rawson's and Mark Jewell's birthdays.

Internal: Teaching contract is signed for \$72 per day.

Contradiction: Setting death ground that community sees as death ground. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Vancouver-Seattle Bi-regional Council at Thunderbird Inn writes Quarter III maneuvers, and celebrates the quarter and new year at House. Visit to Burien School Superintendent nets commitment for three CYFs and three grade school GCFs. Miracle million momentum produces \$1,360 and Seattle Cadre decides to meet an extra night during the next three weeks to set up Burien and Irrigon stronghold events.

Internal: Robertson's daughter, Mariko (born 11/26/78) develops \$5 in church.

Contradiction: Reempowering transrational methods to deal with overwhelming complexity and to enable engagement. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Quarter III maneuvers are planned in depth with help in the arena of Development through Development Centrum visit.

Internal: All-House workday produces inviting new guest rooms and beginning of new office filing system.

Contradiction: Positioning House in front of the door to Los Angeles. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the year with first House Church with 40 in attendance for a turkey feast.

Internal: House successfully negotiates sale of the former house, and carries on floor restoration begun by regional colleagues during Order Council.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of avenues guaranteeing this year's self-support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Two set to go to HDTs raise plane fare in daytime Development visits in Phoenix.

Internal: Tribal Headstart surprises staff with two one-month sojourners from Marywood College, Scranton, Pennsylvania.

Contradiction: Expanding the practical vision from core leadership into broader sweep of the community. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Long-distance Consult preparation becomes reality with the send-out of 18 trucks loaded with food and household gear to Mill Shoals and a pick-up truck with tools, carpenters and decor to Cusick, along with the send-out of seven consultants.

Internal: Collegium room assumes new look with cleaning and painting following departure of trucks.

Contradiction: Operating out of reality of the task never ending and not being paralyzed by the possibility as old patterns break up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Quarter III warboard is completed as Gurkha Development team enables House to create funding maneuvers for the quarter.

Internal: House reimages self-support assignments and prior begins conversations with local Guardians.

Contradiction: Unblocking HDP volunteers to secure travel funds and release Montana manpower to the globe. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Community store has record sales day of \$500.00 while first industry sales call nets order for 12 Trash Barros.

Internal: Darrell Marley returns from month in India, and House celebrates with Chinese meal and the movie *Superman*.

Contradiction: Keeping the plates spinning, while simultaneously training people in plate spinning and taking new plates out of the cupboards of possibility. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Trips to Laramie, Wyoming, Salt Lake City and Price, Utah, as well as Brighton, Colorado, get yeses to all four maneuvers beginning in January, 1979.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are excited as inked wall-to-wall carpet gets installed room by room.

Contradiction: Finding victory for each campaign to be announced on New Year's Eve. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Development maneuver workshops with Gurkha team build maneuvers for Calgary trek.

Internal: House leads full day of CYF training with potential CYF teachers in the area.

Contradiction: Discerning the keystone maneuver that will catapult House into a new orbit of saturation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Joint Regional Council with Seattle builds quarter maneuvers, quickens relationship with Cusick and brings promise of assistance from Bellingham colleagues.

Internal: House returns to full strength as Michael and Elizabeth Neat return to Canada under new employment visa.

Contradiction: Discerning the tactics that will have a multiple catalytic effect. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Team goes to Minto and sits in while entire village council decides to go to Inyan and send Clifford Alexander to HDTs for full eight weeks the next day. All transportation and per diem funding is secured from the village council and Tanana Chiefs Conference (regional association) the same day. A comprehensive file of all grads which has been "being created", is used in Christmastide mailing to 500. Village team is invited to store expansion planning.

Internal: Red book conversation for road troops and ecclesiola study are grounded in drama of community life.

Contradiction: Riding the Minto wave as a House and a movement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Former *Canada World Youth* worker, who spent time in Indonesia and who heard about Vogar from a colleague in Moncton, calls and wants to talk to House.

Internal: House receives Ken Thomas for job hunting and Cyprian D'Souza for Development, and sends out John Scoville to Vogar for planning, and Jen Ross to Edmonton for CYF training.

Contradiction: Changing horses midstream without falling in. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: School contest results in new Vogar Voice masthead. Agent is obtained to market Vogar quilts.

Internal: Self-support in area is enabled by sending Woodbury to Vancouver and Thomas to Saskatoon.

Contradiction: Creating the condition which allows House to deal with its broader responsibilities in the community. (Wk. 4)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: TM is popping loose with Riverside (a neighborhood in Houston) setting up their second annual TM and asking Houston staff to come and also planning a disco dance to pay for it. CYF is held on January 12th in a private school. House member is sent to Asherton to participate in Asherton Winter Garden Maneuver.

Internal: Decor springs to life amidst Operation Flip/Flop as House space design swirls with change in preparation for Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Devising adequate structures for time to deal with space and decor transformation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: *Voice* is distributed in bitter cold (-24° wind chill factor). Community center acquires gigantic wood burning stove. Guild meeting hosts Panchayat visit with global slide show, and Kamela Parekh reports on Maliwada and *Nava Gram Prayas*.

Internal: Panchayat visitation enlightens House with vibrance and comprehensive thinking.

Contradiction: Timing and phasing the quarter's maneuvers with community participation and ownership. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Second quarterly assembly is held with 40 around the table, led by local leadership. Asherton Winter Garden Maneuver sets up 16 events in first week. A Cub Scouts group is formed.

Internal: Don Luigi Persichetti arrives from Houston to help with TM maneuver.

Contradiction: Engaging more community residents in Winter Garden TM Maneuver. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: The Oklahoma City House meets with the Panchayat Sunday through Tuesday, arriving during the middle of six-month maneuver planning, pushing it to the depths. House completes CYF and meets with GWF steering committee to finalize plans for January 20th.

Internal: Roger Marsh is sent out to Florida to join maneuver forces.

Contradiction: Creating workable circuiting and external assignments during the next two weeks that will enable the six-month plan to happen. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House and Development Centrum do week of major funding with visits to four corporations, two foundations and three patrons netting \$2550 in-hand and six proposals working.

Internal: The Global Panchayat visits the Dallas House, holding a global collegium for three days, impacting tri-metro colleagues with global authenticity.

Contradiction: Moving with speed and profundity. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: DPCA elects new officers and meets with Howard Boutte of Southern Cooperative Development Fund about refinancing the laundromat machines. Twenty-one TMs are set for Southern PDD and 13 in Southwestern PDD. A phone call from EDA State Director informs House of possibility of \$300,000 grant for Pace.

Internal: Lights come back on after almost four days ending meals by candlelight and the carrying of water for cooking and washing.

Contradiction: Enabling the PFT group to revitalize the stakes. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Three from House attend Mississippi maneuver planning where the whole sector actualizes its commitment to intensify the maneuver with twice the events in half the time.

Internal: Extended family members heighten Christmas celebration and enable great day of painting the House.

Contradiction: Forging one thrust for the quarter in the midst of broad complex commitments and scattered troops. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mississippi 200 circuiters phone great reports, including Tuscagoola TM, where 40 oyster farmers come not knowing what was happening and asking questions, and leave having experienced a great TM. Television cameras and newspaper reporters give it great press throughout Mobile metropolitan area.

Internal: Two permeators maintain Religious House dynamic with genevas and collegiums and Day II prep for Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Doing what House is assigned to do when responsible for the whole region. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: South DeKalb maneuver goes well with an Imaginal Education course set with local preschools, and two TMs in nearby neighborhoods.

Internal: New internal life is symbolized by new decor in the collegium room.

Contradiction: Building the image of the maneuver in the public mind in order to broaden programmatic format in the geography. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community prepares application for HUD block grant for housing and public facilities which strengthens authorization with town council.

Internal: On the day of the state's severe ice storm, ecclesiola provides oasis of spirit care with special attention to re-creation of space.

Contradiction: Writing quarter's maneuvers to reveal keystone. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Quarterly House maneuvers are created, quickly followed by another maneuver workshop with Development team.

Internal: Circuiter, Roger Marsh, arrives in the middle of the night for a three-week tour of duty.

Contradiction: Regaining lost momentum. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Twenty participants at HDTS are there as a result of the newspaper ads. Operations hammers out victories of the campaigns this quarter. Development circuits are sent out on two-week trips. Accounts are prepared for auditors.

Internal: Nexus builds Tuesday night cleaning blitz into timeline to shift into Epiphany.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between theory and action. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Environmental Maintenance Company is finally approved for city funding of \$100,000 and HDTS begins in Fifth City with 40+ participants. Commercial corporation task force completes first full week and celebrates grocery store's biggest day ever—\$7400 gross sales.

Internal: Major snowstorm adds fluff to birthday celebrations of Lela Mosley (50) and Tad and Todd Mueller (12).

Contradiction: Experiencing weather conditions as victimizing House into starting quarter without context, i.e. no quarter calendar. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Friday night Festival of Lights launches Christmas season with great success. Lights on 110-foot water tower, Snow King and Queen (senior citizens), a Christmas mall (flea market), and a procession down Main Street are highlights of the evening. Over 300 people participate even though it takes place during an ice storm. The *Des Moines Register* picks Lorimor for a December 24 special story on small town community Christmas celebrations. They will be in town several more times during the month. Three TMs are held near Lorimor, and \$3,000 is received from Hy Vee Foods.

Internal: Geoff Nixon has most successful Development week of the quarter (\$11,000 in hand) and picks up surplus desks for the Development office.

Contradiction: Using Christmas momentum to solidly launch next quarter. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Metro colleagues gather Saturday for stronghold maneuver workshop and plan for the community concerns lab to follow each stronghold. Four colleagues spend full time doing stronghold back-up.

Internal: Snowstorm allows intensification of stronghold back-up systems.

Contradiction: Handling on-going crucial practices while focusing on initiating the next stronghold. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development week consumes all in the House with raising monies as the Minneapolis Region Christmas gift to the world. Two thousand dollars is raised over and above the miraculous million bottom line of \$6,000.

Internal: "Santa's Elves" gather with caps on in the evenings to reflect on the day's victories and celebrate with wine and song each night of the Development week.

Contradiction: Defining and placing ourselves on the death ground that will insure victories for the Kinney HDP and regional saturation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: House makes key contacts in coal country stronghold with those who care in Missouri State Community Betterment, Extension Services, and Continental Telephone.

Internal: Regional quarter calendar of events is created in midst of 24-hour New Year celebration.

Contradiction: Waiting for gel to set. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: One House member is sent to St. Louis' coal country stronghold. House sorts out administrative details for housing rehabilitation, sewer, community center, and formally initiates the Agro-Industry Guild.

Internal: Family foundation and CETA provide two salaries to complete self-support requirements.

Contradiction: Determining catalytic events which provide effective organization of resources and people. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Hope for first hockey team in six years becomes visible as workday completes renovated warming house and skating rink in -20°F weather. Thirty-three youth attend "Sunday Night at the Movies."

Internal: Eleven-foot Christmas tree, cut from woods, is trimmed to cap off Advent House decorating.

Contradiction: Communicating the importance of outside-the-Project trips, or how an HDP is different from self-help. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Development team raises money, HDTS prospects and new approaches to stronghold strategy.

Internal: Double study of John Dunne at ecclesiola and following morning's collegium reveals life-giving method that Dunne created.

Contradiction: Effectively announcing HDTS to people who are in transition and searching for options. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Evening with Panchayat fills the House with 45 colleagues and emerging Guardians who experience the possibility of local resurgence. Panchayat highlights GSD update, the Antenens provide TM update and global Guardian greeting, and whole group reflects on the future of the Town Meeting: Indiana campaign.

Internal: The Panchayat trek provides "July in January" with global update, depth pushing on global task and strategy, and refreshing fellowship . . . Global Priority No. 14 was just right.

Contradiction: Getting the legwork done in January to set up the next saturation targets and provide enough time to ensure local funding. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House launches two new metro cadres, secures 20 Guardian commitments to attend Panchayat event, and sends two to HDTS.

Internal: House secures new job for \$12,500 and completes maneuver planning for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Planning the Panchayat visit as key to launching Quarter III maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Panchayat and House host two events—a guild meeting where regional framing is begun, and a meeting for clergy and lay who participated in Detroit saturation to discuss the role of the Church in the urban community.

Internal: Sixteen colleagues get involved as House readies and moves into free 16-room facility in one explosive week in time to receive Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Expanding the Guardian/patron base. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Ten metro colleagues plan for Quarter III Metro Council with House, and decide that the morning reporting session will write and publish a newsletter with features on Quarter II accomplishments.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 50 attending is highlighted by TM and GSD game, including three moves ahead for proper framing and two moves back for funding proposal failure.

Contradiction: Getting the three-year stronghold timeline, which is in everyone's mind, onto the wall. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Impact training weekend launches Smithtown stronghold with regional colleagues ready to lead all forums.

Internal: House sees late-night sneak preview of global film and toasts its completion with champagne.

Contradiction: Utilizing strike and ground forces to the fullest. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Preparation for new quarter is climaxed by workshops with David Dunn from area Development.

Internal: Brian May and Linda Brock bring fresh vitality to House as they begin new assignment here.

Contradiction: Laying the groundwork in the midst of building the superstructure. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Representatives of both Houses in region plus area and nexus Development forces and regional ground force meet in Albany to plan Week 6 regional Development blitz and the implementaries necessary to launch it.

Internal: House sends representatives to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, for Economic Community Forum leadership training event and Youth to New York for CYF training.

Contradiction: Planning the events which ground the necessity of the mission in which House and all colleagues are engaged. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Response to spirit readings at corporate community meetings reflects great hunger for feeding the spirit. CS-1 poetry turns around Economic Commission meeting, and Women's Guild looks forward to sharing readings from *Colored Girls*.

Internal: Sense prevails that the community and House are digging in as more leaders are sent out for training, circuits and global service.

Contradiction: Releasing the interchange of roles to allow all tasks to be done with revolutionary style. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Week's activities include seeking new pallet contract, planning community and 4-H Club meetings, and gym cleaning blitz.

Internal: Nelson hitchhikes to Charleston to buy a car.

Contradiction: Doing the set-up work that's necessary now to bring off Development and saturation maneuver for quarter. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Key urban coalition staff person affirms the rightness of House's move back to the urban in Philadelphia and provides the precise selling point—city neighborhoods are ready to move on their own. They are tired of waiting for government to take care of them.

Internal: Pledge system, initiated this week, with pledge sign-up and record-keeping card, a thank you card, and a reminder card, is already getting positive responses.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the demands to be comprehensive and the day-to-day exciting breaklooses that cause House to focus on the moment. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: House sends \$500 more to Global Development as money continues to come in from requests made last quarter.

Internal: The first of a quarter-long series of ur images collegiums whets House's appetite for more.

Contradiction: Completing designs for Quarter III that enable House to utilize strike force to the fullest. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Stories around initiation of the heritage project make people say that this was the best guild meeting ever. Fire Department unanimously votes to work on ice rink—first yes to HDP involvement.

Internal: Collegiums on public image with Delores Morrill, V. O'Halloran and J. Troxel push self-understanding.

Contradiction: Releasing the town to accept itself as an HDP. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: The Development planning workshop provides an avenue for wider involvement by colleagues and creates new enthusiasm. An updated mailing list is completed and typed onto address labels. Every day of next week has an appointment for GCF scheduled.

Internal: Ecclesiola college and seminary allow for a serious exchange of opinions, and sodality is fun.

Contradiction: Maintaining organization and discipline to make sure that interest and enthusiasm result in programs and money. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER—CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Presentation on proposed firewood business to 40 people, including county officials, Guardians and community people, is the occasion for significant breakloose in local leadership as community people play all up-front roles.

Internal: Refreshing study of "Community" paper and fine ecclesiola seem to enable breakloose in quarter planning.

Contradiction: Pushing open the gate to release core of supporters who are chomping at the bit to start the race. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two communities from Quarter II stronghold intend to hold larger Community Forums in their towns. One date is already set.

Internal: House holds a great stay-at-home celebration with pizza and ice cream.

Contradiction: Finding a practical way to cover the Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, stronghold with troops. (Wk. 4)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Quarter is off to a fine start in all arenas as \$25,000 check is picked up for global Development (making \$27,500 for week). Area Council produces team of 10 permeators and time line is created for Montreal GWF.

Internal: Quarter III Area Council meets in two locations with Emerging Generation structure, "The Chosen in '79," held in new rent-free facility.

Contradiction: Building strategy in midst of House moving. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House focuses on HDTs recruitment through religious orders and newspaper ad.

Internal: House celebrates third week of Advent tidings of great joy with cutting of Christmas tree and going to a performance of Handel's *Messiah*.

Contradiction: Getting hold of a broad frame of authorization and networks to do saturation in Halton Region and municipality. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Fishers are off on first visit to Sudbury Region this year. Two are sent packing to HDTs. Toronto House and metro colleagues join in Week II of materials writing and editing.

Internal: House is thrown into re-evaluation of all internal structures in preparation for two sojourners next week.

Contradiction: Reaching consensus on and sticking to the long-range priorities in midst of quickly changing situation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Cadre of *Treize Gaspeiens* saturation begins strategizing polis forums' followup. Dieppe saturation is full speed ahead through collaboration with city recreation department.

Internal: House sends half of staff to self-support in city 200 miles away.

Contradiction: Stimulating community to pick up roles formerly carried out by the ICA, especially funding and capital development. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Trips to Colombia and Curacao open up impact courses and Development prospects. Updating the Bishop of the State of Miranda (Bernal-Ortiz) reveals his close ties with the new Venezuelan government and receives promise of letter of Cardinal in Lima.

Internal: House experiences New Year's as discontinuity.

Contradiction: Re-imaging House as colleagues working with the village, rather than as employers or patrons. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: House makes increasing use of community resources: local transportation for bakery supplies, local clubs to make decor, and many Christmas songs for the songbook. All of these are used to bring off children's program on the 23rd and party Christmas night.

Internal: Groups return from Continental Council and Brazilian exchange.

Contradiction: Organizing time for reflection and analysis of the state of the Project. (Wk. 2)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: New community post office is inaugurated, complete with firecrackers, speeches and local politicians. The week focuses on the opening of the bakery with bakery painting and equipment construction, a trip to Silva Jardim with the four community bakers to learn to bake bread, and the community's eating the first product—a cake—at the community meeting. Bananeiras graduates 18 from preschool with all families present at the graduation. Development comes through with 92,000 cruzeiros (US\$5,000). Thirteen boxes of zucchini are harvested and cucumbers are coming.

Internal: Raul and Jose' cook a fine Chilean feast for the auxiliary and are sent out the following Tuesday with a champagne breakfast.

Contradiction: Focusing next quarter's activities on economic, agriculture and health miracles, while riding the wave of increased community participation. (Wk. 3)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The demonstration garden doubles in size and the Department of Agriculture visits to lay out terraces, drainage ditches and beds that will grow new, high-profit crops.

Internal: The House celebrates Ron Shepherd's 45th birthday with a chicken dinner, rum punch, recollections, and promises.

Contradiction: Organizing the workforce to build the tool pool and industrial sheds without losing momentum on the preschool. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Project "goes public" in a new way with presentation to Guatemala Rotary Club, in the midst of planning for Quarter III.

Internal: Visit of Judy Boyd's parents brings new faces and a new sky-light to Conacaste.

Contradiction: Mobilizing forces to deal creatively with Development. (Wk. 4)

WEEK FOUR

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a workshop in Hong Kong on all the circuits for quarter gives comprehensive input to planning images and illuminates the related flow of actions required to insure victory in all arenas. Chicago shifts team assignments, creates the new story, brainstorms new decor, while all 36 Houses are visited, and remaneuver for Quarter III. A German church sends in \$3,500 from its Christmas bazaar. Marists in Brussels come through with \$1,200 at a week's notice on first contact. The quarter is launched with planning PSU, the ability to shift to new mood of 1979 with new quarter images and a new decision toward aggressive public images including global bank of materials. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pushing insights on the new dimensions of responsibility to the practical forms needed to insure implementation of Quarter III Development maneuver.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports discovery of a method for screening the *Journal* quotes that seems to be effective. Centrum is astounded at the impact of the "Wall of Wonder." Nexus machinery works well. "Wall of Wonder" produces profound response of anyone who works on it. The key contradiction lies in the arena of insufficient inner-communication.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the initiation of 110 strongholds in North America this quarter through the use of local and state networks. London holds demonstration LENS that leads to commitment for four more—two in February and two more in Quarter IV. Despite a snowstorm which cripples transportation across the City of Chicago, 5,000 copies of the *Voice* are distributed on time in Uptown. The Bailey's quarantine in Guam results in 20 Town Meetings being scheduled there. The key contradiction is in the arena of webbing the campaigns into a clear, single thrust, and creating the effective form of sharing learnings.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports all locations in preparation and anticipation of the internal audits and band meeting in Weeks 5 and 6. Brussels reports enthusiastically on the Africa council and the establishment of reporting financial systems. Global Order funds report through December is received from Hong Kong. Chicago anticipates preparation of a global picture of the funds through December at band meeting. Chicago shovels out of a major blizzard with a new snowblower. Corporate efforts across posts and centruns to break through major contradictions and jobs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the objective requirements and time to keep current which reduce capacity to do analysis, consulting and advisory services.
