

Internal: Chicago, Minneapolis, Richgrove, Lorimor and Cincinnati enable Kinney's conference and around the edges conversations foreshadow the GRA and Council agenda.

Contradiction: Turning excited program leaders into those who care comprehensively for the whole Project. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Forty participate in House Church with Don Richards as celebrant to welcome him back from a year in Guatemala. A slide presentation follows the House Church.

Internal: House extends invitations to colleagues who can't make it to the GRA to participate as sojourners sometime during July.

Contradiction: Falling back on tried tactics rather than applying imaginal methods in doing GRA recruitment. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: A major addition to state frame comes with hour-long appointment with Indianapolis Mayor Bill Hudnut who opens by thanking ICA for taking time to see him and indicates willingness to provide active support for many ICA programs. Lafayette cadre uses year-end celebration as occasion to involve new contacts and send out recent Academy grad, Nancy Bain to staff sixth grad trip.

Internal: Paula Craddock brings Peru slides for a Saturday night sneak preview at House.

Contradiction: Creating an effective timeline and set of block club recruitment tactics to undergird Mapleton-Fall Creek stronghold early Quarter I. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: CYF date is set for Kentucky National Honors Society conference in Quarter II.

Internal: House completes relocation move with 15 colleagues and neighbors helping.

Contradiction: Keeping attention on the comprehensive mission while unpacking and settling in new facility. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Seven sent out to Global Research Assembly.

Internal: House outside painted by 20 in on day is seen as parish miracle.

Contradiction: Obtaining the needed authorization for umbrella funding. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: GRA recruitment and visitation is done geographically by turf teams.

Internal: Documentation of TM: Cleveland inspires House to reorganize files to tell the TM story.

Contradiction: Inspiring Metro Council participants to go to the GRA. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Regional colleagues display methodological prowess in leadership roles as regional council sends out 90% of its body to GRA.

Internal: Chris and Maria Eversole's arrival for Quarter I sojourn initiates space shift to accommodate reduction in House troops.

Contradiction: Deciding the appropriate focus for July in House and region. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Appointment with Cathy Irvis, co-chairperson for International Year of the Child in Pennsylvania, astonishes House with the eagerness of IYC to do CYFs and Cathy Irvis' willingness to help get us in touch with top state officials in governor's office.

Internal: House celebrates the covenanting of the Brian and Linda May family.

Contradiction: Focusing in on present task while attention and demands point elsewhere. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Development contacts 100 people in Buffalo. Global film is shown three times in region. Buffalo colleagues commit themselves to continue calling for third Buffalo *Evening at the Institute* at the end of the month.

Internal: House sparkles for *1 Evening with the Institute*.

Contradiction: Maintaining current positioning throughout Quarter I. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Spirit of Phase I impacts Ivy City as a youth group of 15 from upstate New York works here all week. Fifty youth from across the District gather for orientation as they prepare to serve as the Washington Youth Corps assigned to Ivy City for the Summer.

Internal: House experiences globality as it hosts 45 visitors including a group from Woburn Lawn, Jamaica; Peter Whild from Australia; Linda and Aaron Knutsen from the Philippines and Sarah and Sangeeta Parekh enroute to Bombay.

Contradiction: Keeping excitement in the task in the midst of discontinuity and fluidity of people. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Seventeen churchmen from Hillsdale, Michigan, come to clear lots and build a fine bulletin board while thirteen members of Widen Youth Corps paint the grill and a house.

Internal: Mood of celebration prevails when whole crew goes to visit coal mine in Beckley and has fine meals all week.

Contradiction: Maintaining the decision to move at the local level in the face of direct encounters with the global malaise. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Key meeting with the wife of Pennsylvania House Minority Leader opens up additional steps on state campaign positioning.

Internal: House is impacted Wednesday night with Marsha Hahn's continental update.

Contradiction: Keeping state momentum going when imaginal energies of the Movement are focused on the GRA. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Regional council, where the story of awakening is created and absolution is experienced, completes the year. The June newsletter is on the press and into the mailing house system.

Internal: A series of provocative collegiums includes projecting 1979-80 Global Priorities; testing and reflecting new language in liturgy and song and envisioning honoring the other by winning.

Contradiction: Deciding on appropriate focus for July in the House and region. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: May's miracles are topped off by the completion and opening of the Chintz Cottage Thrift Store and Craft Outlet in the Corn Shop. At the same time, Chapter II of the Starks History goes on sale. Three community representatives sign contract to buy corn shop building and EDA pre-proposal is submitted for that purpose.

Internal: *Miracle Month of May* ends with colleagues from three stakes celebrating with late night dinner and four layer chocolate birthday cake the memories and expenditure of the Project's first year in Starks.

Contradiction: Getting a clear image of the legal forms in order to ask for specific ways of participating. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: House makes village adoption presentation to Trinity Church in Shelburne Falls, Massachusetts. GRA phoning and appointments continue. *Earthrise* pins are prepared for New York Area GRA contestants. ICA receives \$1640 in developed money.

Internal: House travels to New York City for May-Brock wedding.

Contradiction: Determining what will make for an eventful summer for House, colleagues and the region. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Construction moves ahead on wood splitting machine for firewood industry with many details being handled for land, building and other business issues.

Internal: Job hunting maneuver grounds *Sources of Courage* collegium, as two of four people seeking temporary summer jobs are assigned to enablement for the GRA and the other begins lining up jobs.

Contradiction: Claiming the appropriate "death ground" and focusing the available resources in order to achieve concrete victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Global film impacts old colleagues at Christ Episcopal Church, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and nurtures relationship of church to ICA programs.

Internal: House space recreation produces new look and new organization.

Contradiction: Creating an image of engagement for local colleagues over the summer. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House spends three half-days inking for GWF and breaks back of logistical headaches. Training session held for translator who sings three Greek songs specially composed for the day.

Internal: Goodie bag from Toronto for GRA recruitment sparks wonder and fascination with history of Research Assembly past, present and future.

Contradiction: Maintaining practical momentum over against sense of very uncertain victory. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Key regional Guardian initiates meeting with officials of North York, Toronto, for future ICA programs.

House hosts seven people at dinner for GRA recruitment and Global Film showing. Meeting with Vice President of Administration for York University opens door for students to participate in HDPs as their study program.

Internal: House hosts and sends out area emerging Generation and youth to summer camp.

Contradiction: Operating with long-range implications thinking rather than immediate advantages to include local, areal and global concerns ensuring correct timing and victory. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sudbury 2001 Assembly draws over 100 people from 25 communities together to build coordinating tactics.

Internal: Women of House hold year-end celebration. Kids have barbecue in preparation for the shift to camp.

Contradiction: Setting fresh contexts for formulation that relate to presently felt local urgencies. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: The Merry Month of May is brought to a resounding conclusion with three gala film events with 25 Guardians in Bathurst, St. John and Fredericton. The sendout of Mr. Jesse Dixon who had come from South Carolina to spend three weeks sharing his expertise with the woodworking industry, registration of 50% of next year's first graders in the preschool first grade prep program and community leadership deciding to purchase house for auxiliary.

Internal: Emma Kirsten Francis makes her entry into the Merry Month of May, born Sunday May 27, rather than awaiting her June 1st scheduled date of arrival.

Contradiction: Creating occasions when the community wrestles authentically with their vision of the future and with their responsibility for bringing it off. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: The College of Professional Nurses invites Caracas ICA to do first all-Spanish Global Women's Forum. LENS procedures are translated by enthusiastic grads. In Cano Negro the industry storage shed is completed with cement roof and chapel into final phase of roof and doors.

Internal: Helen Worden, Becky Appenfelder, Trudi Mueller and Kathy Tomlinson stop on the way from Chile via Peruvian consult to give glowing report of Azpitia's first week.

Contradiction: Empowering secretariat and sector meetings from back of the room. (Wk. 1)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Mary Landau, wife of U.S. Ambassador, visits Sol de Septiembre for the first year anniversary celebration of the Project and at a Santiago fair where sewing industry articles are sold, she promises to host an October bazaar featuring only Sol de Septiembre items. Sewing industry receives donation of 1,000 meters of denim cloth from large material manufacturer. Large food chain purchasing agent visits to arrange for purchase of greenhouse vegetables for Santiago supermarket.

Internal: The Victor Caro-Margarita Lara family join auxiliary along with their two children.

Contradiction: Maintaining focus when new logistics are demanded because of smaller auxiliary and larger core of community responsible for Project activities. (Wk. 1)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: First anniversary celebration planning and preparation moves into high gear as all groups prepare their part in the program.

Internal: Collegiums pointing to coming year in Bananeiras, area and continent push visions of possibility, revealing how far Latin America has come this year.

Contradiction: Facing the ambiguity in all decisions during the transition from Quarter IV to the next year. (Wk. 1)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Anniversary celebration erupts in week of work and wonder, highlighted by first-ever ecumenical service led by Cayman Islands ITI grad, Rev. Lawrence Small. All day assembly led by stake leaders and five simultaneous stake workdays produce four new flower gardens, three resurrected ones, and a grand day of celebration, including fair, banquet, sports and all night dance. Guests include diplomatic representation from three continents (UK, Australia and USA), local public and private sectors and ITI host committee.

Internal: Mervis Edwards returns from Azpitia Consult standing tall and filled with stories of victory.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in place for July and August during the next 10 days, while raising \$6000 to finance it all. (Wk. 13)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: AID proposal signed this week assures \$2100 for potable water well. Fifty-five cement latrines arrive for village sanitation program. Doctor announces he has succeeded in controlling cases of dysentery in village. Plaza events, including movies, draw large crowds.

Internal: Work on annual report provides time for feet-on-the-table dynamic.

Contradiction: Determining daily and weekly time designs to provide for the greatest degree of troop effectiveness. (Wk. 1)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: An explosion of activity following the Consult initiates the preschool, nightly English classes with over 100 in attendance, mail service, health clinic, *La Voz*, the plaza laid out in white stones and *pisco* (brandy) distilling industry.

Internal: Luis Aburto, the mayor's son, is welcomed into the House as a sojourner. Twenty global consultants are sent out in a series of *gran fiestas*.

Contradiction: Creating initiation phase structures to catch up with acceleration pace. (Wk. 13)

WEEK ONE —

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Chicago takes annual report to Better Business Bureau, in New York City and is told ICA has best authorization in their books, and no trouble answering inquiries. Brussels receives authorization letter from U.S. Ambassador to Italy after site visit to Termine. Continued authorization enhances both development and program advantages. The key contradiction lies in the arena of using the summer as an advantage, not as a distraction to momentum.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the GRA is stunned by a day studying the nine continents of the globe, followed by a day listening to saturation experiences, followed by a day of demonstration and replication. Camp goes well. First two lectures on *The Way* promise a fruitful year ahead for depth research, as question of mobile Global Research Assembly is raised. The key contradiction lies in the arena of staying relaxed on next year until the phenomenal reality of last year sinks in on us, while keeping ourselves grounded in real advantages.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports completing retiling of guild hall floor, washing of second floor windows (in and out) and progress on cleaning of terra cotta face of building, recreation of second floor with removal of N.E. corner storage rooms, new wall on north end and repairing and repainting of all walls. Brussels reports receiving Africa year end reports. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pulling together of all threads of tax and legal obligations to the establishment.

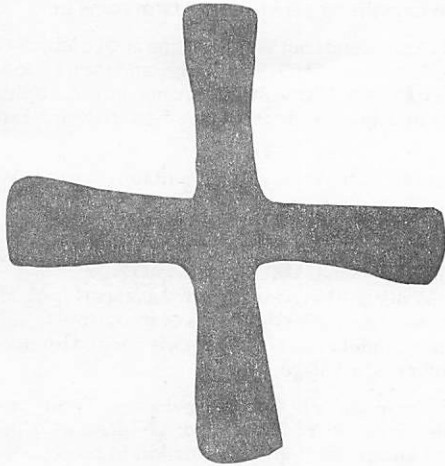
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports demonstration CYF's in Atlanta and Philadelphia each set up a series for Quarter II. Arizona saturation campaign is completed with 123 GCFs held. Major company LENS is held as a joint seminar with Bell Telephone Laboratories and AT&T. Field victories require strategies for expanded programs across the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of ensuring September start-up by continuing set-up work in July and August when forces are scattered.

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Development shows Global Film to Chairman of the Board of British Petroleum and company secretary who decide to print Tai'rgwaith full color brochure. Datchet TM with 30 people present meets in small village-executive bedroom community for London. Town Meeting Report of the 232 TMs held in the UK in 3 years is printed and ready for distribution.

Internal: Flood of colleagues from UK, Germany, India and Africa rushes through London on way to GRA. Colleague from Nigeria, Peter Malaba, arrives for sojourn in London.

Contradiction: Getting the five development maneuvers moving for the summer campaign: "Harnessing the Awakening." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Last two Town Meetings of the region happen through the Roman Catholic network with regional family team carrying the ball. Global Film Nights bring together neighbors and colleagues in Glasgow and Edinburgh.

Internal: Ruth Dyhr's mother comes for brief holiday and bakes for Evening at the Institute.

Contradiction: Shifting gears for next phase of every which way but loose. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Outstanding Carnival week expodes in the community with a blaze of color, noise, excitement and almost total community participation. A series of Development calls break loose major in-kind printing of new brochure and possibility of packing contract for women's industry. Three showings of the Global Film rehearse the HDP story.

Internal: House sends out Coffman's after three years in Bristol and Tai'rgwaith. Community youth keep asking when are they coming back.

Contradiction: Creating the summer rhythm for urgent outside work while the weather still holds. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Three circuits are manned by colleagues completing 21 TMs in TM Jubilee Campaign. House mails 107 follow-up letters to interested people and 25 to autumn possibilities.

Internal: Collegium on personal part of *Wall of Wonder* grounds power of charting.

Contradiction: Closing TM Jubilee Campaign in the midst of ongoing TMs with follow-up in the hands of regions so as not to lose advantages gained. (Wk. 13)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Meeting with Monsieur Martin of Calvados Department insures initial success of the Caen-Can stronghold maneuver.

Internal: Nine-continent feast culminates week of evaluation and planning.

Contradiction: Transferring rapid set-up victories into depth stronghold realities. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: First table comes off production line. August Vanistendahl addresses Superiors General on Development and the ICA. Sacred Heart General Chapter views the Global Film. Check for 350,000 lira arrives from Lady of Zion. House inkind three cars from L'Aquila car dealers for Town Meeting circuits. New workbook is printed.

Internal: Termine auxiliary moves to temporary housing and waits for breakthrough in permanent location.

Contradiction: Finding a place to live in a village so changed that everyone wants their houses. (Wk. 13)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: *Voice* with images and articles on community industries is distributed throughout the community. HDTs

participants return from Nairobi creating new images for participation.

Internal: Ecclesiola using paper on *Village Revolution* creates awe of participating in great historical trends.

Contradiction: Phasing the capital investment victories into the next phase of expansion. (Wk. 13)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Order: Ecumenical May report is finished amidst a 24 hour telephone marathon for global ticketing.

Internal: The revolving door at the Wayside Inn moves continuously as traffic moves toward Chicago and the GRA.

Contradiction: Focusing the images of practical doing amidst a shift from Centrum oriented work to Nexus/cross centrum work and a shift from the old year into the new. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Brussels Regional Council with Global Film and conversation on future strongholding caps a week of celebration and send outs of Paul Schrijnen to GRA and Manuel Guillot to Paris.

Internal: Quarter evaluation completed with collegium on stronghold learnings.

Contradiction: Keeping region going during summer to yield needed autumn harvest. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: First Netherlands Dorpsdag Advisory Board Meeting held in Netherlands with Global Film kicking off lively and enthusiastic discussion of the aims of the ICA in the Netherlands. Board brainstorm ideas for prologue to National Report of first 50 Dorpsdag.

Internal: House is spruced up and fixed up in preparation for Advisory Board Meeting while preparing to send three-fourths of itself to GRA and camp.

Contradiction: Turning openness and enthusiasm of Guardians attending Advisory Board Meeting into effective action in the three campaigns. (Wk. 2)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Training weekend for 15 HDP Volunteers from four nations is marked by suspense filled drama of trying to phone Italy for confirmation and finally getting through at the last minute. House holds last three Gemeindeforums of the year including two of which cover polis 215 and 216.

Internal: House sends out the first wave of GRA participants including Elizabeth, Ben, Matthew, Richard and Florian. The Quarterly Newsletter mailing list is revised, envelopes addressed and stamped and Newsletter sent to the printer.

Contradiction: Getting trapped in the vacation mindset thinking the year ought to be a gradual winding down rather than the perpetual whirlwind it is. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: House contacts key persons of the Institute of City and Rural Development. Community elects a new Board of Directors for next year at first Vereins Meeting. Four TMs launch Berlin TM Campaign.

Internal: House finishes and mails GRA sessions to Chicago.

Contradiction: Discerning the point of history where the Project is right now in relationship to 1979-80 direction. (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Large group of Zambian Chiefs visit KHDP and are overwhelmed. On seeing three-year-old Shinondo, leading 160 preschoolers in songs and rituals, money is immediately pulled out of pockets for the school. The Chiefs judge the five stake shelters built by residents and award "The Most Outstanding Stake" award, an engraved copper bowl, to Stake Three. Inspired by Kapini's Health Care system, a new course in primary health care for villagers is designed by the Ministry and village caretakers attend first session. Applications from Kapini families to farm the 20-acre irrigated farm come in.

Internal: House sends out Walter Nkana and Eusebio Muloshi, interns, to last week of HDTs in Nairobi and then on to Malawi for ITI recruitment. Vic Manchishi, once intern, sojourns on weekends at Kapini, demonstrating new style for Extended Order.

Contradiction: Getting ITI recruitment fully in gear. (Wk. 12)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water gushing forth from *hanafeyas* (public water taps) in all six stakes drowns images of impossibility while the first complete toilet and shower block is opened for public use in the center of the village.

Internal: Presence of the Greg Farley family of four necessitates creation of a dorm for children who begin to impact the village through participation in preschool lesson planning and Arabic lessons.

Contradiction: Discerning the next peak to climb that will beckon village motivation now that water is accessible to every home. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Lunch collegiums for the Kawangware managers becomes powerful time in each day. House fire in Kawangware, killing one child, is put out successfully by residents before fire truck arrives. Presentation of K.Shs 5000 by Boots Company chairman from UK on the same day as he receives Knighthood from Queen Elizabeth. Farm industries reorganize and begin new farm with six eggs laid for the new market. Firestone presents 10 tires and tubes to Kawangware with press coverage. ATT International commits grant in amount of K.Shs 410,000 for intensification and expansion of Kawangware Industries. Lima Ltd. supplies a tractor for all ploughing. The roof of the training center used for HDTI is removed as the move to Kabiyo begins.

Internal: House sends out Were family to Kamweleni as back-up priorship family. George Black returns on way to USA and checks on progress made since HDTI

Contradiction: Focusing victory that puts day by day activities into winning thrust. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELANI—KAMWELANI HDP

External: Pump and pipes are delivered. Standard four classroom walls start going up. Stake leaders play role of auxiliary as forty work on pathways in spite of heavy rain.

Internal: Three day fast culminating in night watch intensifies missional demand.

Contradiction: Mobilizing community effectively with limited staff. (Wk. 12)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Site selection is accomplished for the 75 Projects, and the third draw of the first installment of the EEC grant is received, pushing a long way toward the completion of the 232.

Internal: A week of collegiums in preparation for the GRA and the CRA (Continental Research Assembly) prove to be a great advantage toward the future of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between bolstering the 232 and moving into the 2500. (Wk. 10)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Evening with the Institute, including global film showing, hosts representatives from World Bank, AID, Rotary Club and Madangeer Community Development Group. Three roads are bricked in Sikror. Mr. Manmohan Singh, Rural Development Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce, sets Development appointments. Stake meeting is held. One man is sent to HDTS. Deputy Panchayat Raj Officer visits village.

Internal: Laxmi and Vinod Yadav join Sikror auxiliary.

Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTS which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: All centurms are represented in planning meeting.

Internal: Dinner with Guardian couple highlights year's end.

Contradiction: Appropriating the care provided by the structures of society. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Serusup has great first year anniversary with the Minister of Youth, Culture and Sports officiating. Workdays all week beautify the village until it shines. Twenty-four pound cake with a large Serusup grid done in pink icing travels 30 miles in one piece. Health Caretakers have two days training in nutrition and cooking and prepare beautiful luncheon meal for guests after the tour of all new buildings in Serusup. Special presentations to the Project include a Hi-Ace truck from Toyota, an outboard motor from Yammota, three sewing machines for Handicrafts industry and \$200 worth of preschool supplies from Inner Wheel Service Club. Fifty T-shirts with Serusup grid and slogan are sold.

Internal: Joel Wright arrives to represent the area and to do Development.

Contradiction: Training the shadows faster in order to move into the next phase of the Project. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Grad village celebration planned and executed by youth has marching bands, traditional singing and dancing, competition including climbing greased tree, and disco. Pasar celebrates its past success and plans for further expansion into supplying the provision shops with basic commodities. House part with 12 guests including Board of Directors member who in turn invites whole House plus Nexus over for American meal at his house. Agricultural Guild clears many of the 50 acres available for banana plantations aided by two Canadian sojourners. Youth plant corn and two begin fish farm. Village schedules the maintenance of all equipment. Esso man from Houston, Texas, visits to see how his church's adoption of Indian village helps development.

Internal: Canadian students, Alex Eglis and Don Rutherford, sojourn for a month.

Contradiction: Discerning the appropriate steps for expansion across Malaysia when 600 villages want to use ICA methods. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Meeting with Head of Regional Planning, West Java, promises last step in securing long awaited authorization to have KHDP adopted as official demonstration. \$1000 over-the-road welcome sign paid for by multi-national.

Internal: Auxiliary sends out Soehardi family and Fata. Quarter planning is on target!

Contradiction: Relating KHDP to a local village network. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: New coastal village project manager for Bubun enables new fact to shine: white poles and lines take electricity to mosque, old boat landing come down, new Dised Pontai and Project office creates meeting room and guest room, builds small TV house in village square is built, villagers are hired for construction and generator maintenance. Girls volleyball team builds court. House fences one hectare garden and plants vegetables. Stake workdays spray and repair road, build drain and new bridge and cut wood for more fences. Two families move into new houses. Three GCF teams out to do six GCFs.

Internal: Auxiliary facility gets new paint to keep up with village. Four carpenters live in and participate in structures.

Contradiction: Transferring to village leadership an adequate understanding of what it means to catalyze and elicit full participation from stakes and guilds. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Organizing to accomplish the tasks of the next six weeks and launching the Quarter. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: ICA receives largest grant in Hong Kong of \$71,000. Two more Forums are held. Village prepares for foundations annual general elections. Village leader obtains visa to attend Chicago Prior's Council. Five women start producing fashion accessory bags in new cottage industry.

Eric Bashforth, Director of Kaohsiung Monomer Co. brings his wife to celebration and both leave very excited about the possibilities of personally engaging in the Project's work next year.

External: Fresno County Campaign ends with 10 saturation events complete including two CYFs, a Special Issues Forum on community safety and TMs. Working with County Supervisor's recommendation is found as helpful advocate. House hosted Mary D'Souza's parents and sister's family with the Global Film.

Internal: All day year-end evaluation while completing wall of wonder and envisioning the future has House anticipating urban impact and moving massively.

Contradiction: Getting ready for what we don't know. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Hard work and sweat all week produces Week II with a variety of miracles including landscaping the plaza with approximately \$400 of inkind plants, arrival of laundromat washers and dryers, education module which produces day camp curriculum for summer, and flea market continues to be Sunday event in the community.

Internal: House self-support begins with Ken Filipski's job at \$14,000 per year and finishes with beginnings of House garden.

Contradiction: Releasing people to take on long-lasting circuit responsibility. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Forty-two people take a fish to dinner and have a grand time at the community fish fry. The CCDA Board decides job titles and descriptions with priorities for six new possible VISTA positions.

Internal: Collegium on "Earthrise" reminds House once again of power and role of the myth and of awe. Auxiliary begins to pull together their wisdom on the journey of the community during its first year in a Project.

Contradiction: Getting the summer youth trip firmed up with schedule, transportation, cost and firm "yeses." (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: GWF of 34 women expose TWC to each other across the networks in Seattle. Cluster TM follow-up meeting group decides to act on behalf of all without being elected officials.

Internal: Ecclesiola excitedly names categories of the future vision with the reflection "We just did a half-day workshop in 30 minutes."

Contradiction: Creating and communicating the one image that will focus the next eight weeks' efforts to a grand finale. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Invitations to Richgrove *Milagro de Mayo* are sent to all colleagues. Four-county saturation strategy is launched by all three California Houses in Richgrove.

Internal: House gets spirit boost in Week II at Richgrove.

Contradiction: Turning end of year slump into launching pad. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: The Arizona 120 closes with a GWF in Welton and Billing. The 76 Town Meetings held in June net a total of \$15,980. House spends the weekend gestalting challenges and proposals that will enable the creation of an Arizona State Report.

Internal: House celebrates the new year with House Church followed by a swim party.

Contradiction: Facing the urgency of the decision relative to next year's strategy within the ambiguity of the unknown global priorities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Demonstration farm raises \$200 in two days for gas money to run pump by selling purchased melons. Pisinemo sends local representatives to Indian Center Town Meetings in Tucson and Phoenix.

Internal: House spends discontinuous weekend in Phoenix celebrating with colleagues the completion of Arizona 120.

Contradiction: Allowing arenas of action to be narrowed by transportation and acquisition breakdowns. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: The whole week is spent preparing and celebrating the annual Cannon Ball Pow-Wow with two days of clean-up, junk car removal, new space for day care, a \$3800 inventory order delivered to the store and three days of dancing.

Internal: House sends out the two priests from Germany to continue their trek to Pace HDP.

Contradiction: Holding fast to the confusion until it becomes clarity. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: House gets June newsletter out and plans trip to Kalispell for June 22. One house member changes jobs without losing a day's work and another gets a \$50 per month raise.

Internal: Emerging Generation finish school for the year with one getting the class citizenship award and the other getting the scholarship award.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the immediate and the long-range. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Corporation hires two new employees. Cafe and store have record month of sales in June. A Cannon Ball is installed in the plaza.

Internal: House spends the fourth of July cleaning and adding fresh decor in the entry way.

Contradiction: Engendering a summer of productivity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Positioning for next year continues with visits to Salt Lake City, Utah and Wheatland and Laramie, Wyoming. Surprise appointment with the State Director and Assistant of the Wyoming Energy Extension Service opens state-wide community college network. In Colorado key appointments set with agency heads.

Internal: Celebrative mood pervades the House with sendouts for Shawne and Chris and planning for the year end regional celebration.

Contradiction: Molding practical forms to hold all the data. (Wk. 12)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Two men go on key visits in order to complete funding proposals for portable sawmill and dump truck operation.

Internal: Focusing weekly collegiums in leadership development reveals great potential and produces a training design.

Contradiction: Staging the events and contacts of this week in order to build momentum for Panchayat visit at end of week. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Community Forum is held with the British Columbia Coalition for the Disabled. There are 26 participants present, including executives of the major handicapped groups in Vancouver and the Lower Mainland. It is a great success with coverage by the Kinsmen's magazine and plans for a larger Forum at their annual meeting with 150-200 people. Three more checks arrive bringing the total in-hand from the Development week to \$1483, the highest weekly total ever for the Vancouver Region.

Internal: Year-end celebration picnic feels more like a New Year's celebration as it is immediately preceded by a workshop in which colleagues help to create seven maneuvers for the next year.

Contradiction: Choosing the events, activities and structures which are appropriate to Quarter I time and troops and yet which maintain the momentum achieved this last quarter. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Forth of July celebration dominates the week with three days of races, dancing, softball and more from afternoon till early morning. Festivities close with Potluck supper and awards ceremony, followed by more dancing. One of the two new CETA employees complete a \$10,000 recreation proposal at the request of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Internal: Staff dig a new yard drainage system with landfill going around the house for insulation against winter winds.

Contradiction: Enabling key village decisions that will allow quarter victories to begin to take shape. (Wk. 3)

Internal: House sends out Yvonne Myers at final House Church for the year.

Contradiction: Balancing local immediacies in midst of preparing for departure for Chicago and unclarity on travel. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Grey Nuns and LEAP staff visit Vogar. House mails two-year brochure. Grey Nuns and CAPHER conference view "World of Human Development." Auxiliary visits Baconridge with positive response from community leadership.

Internal: Sister Mary Teresa Antaya joins staff for six weeks to work with village adults.

Contradiction: Setting into motion the tactics that will produce the village structures for the future. (Wk. 2)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Eighteen participants attend RS-1 at Christ the King Lutheran Church and discover that the power of this experience has not diminished. Metro meeting writes Houston story and story for themselves. Members volunteer for task force assignments.

Internal: House is visited by five from Chicago and is treated to collegium by Mark Poole on El Bayad and the Middle East.

Contradiction: Maintaining and building momentum through summer months to ready for fall campaign in Houston. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Meeting in Oklahoma City with governor's aide, Cindy Worley and state Senator John Clifton pushes Town Meeting State Campaign down the road. Key appointment is set for next week with Director of Department of Economic and Community Affairs. House inkinds 24,000 sheets of paper—a year's supply for Voice newsletter.

Internal: The highlight of ecclesioa is "glimpsing into the darkness."

Contradiction: Establishing the meeting preparation and format for launching the community development corporation. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Workday succeeds in raising posters in Asherton and neighboring towns to invite all to first annual celebration. Halsell Foundation sends surprise \$500 donation for day care center. Great-grandson of Asherton's founder visits to plan industry and day care center. Library's staff visits San Antonio to pick up donated materials. Architect meets with housing authority to refine pre-application for rental housing. Big Wells and Batesville invite ICA to set up satellite projects.

Internal: House vehicles are restored to life.

Contradiction: Binding the multiplicity of leaders and programs into one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Shelley Reese goes to Texas for Amarillo CYF. GRA recruitment starts with Oklahoma mailing list of 1000 plus names and five divisions.

Internal: House youth and adults hold separate celebrations as tickets to the Oklahoma premiere of *Rocky II* are won from a local radio station and tickets to a stage production of *Fiddler on the Roof* are contributed by a friend.

Contradiction: Moving through the lazy days of summer at a winning pace. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: House sends Dane Adkinson to GRA. Conventions with an Oak Cliff community group relative to their sponsoring a neighborhood TM results in proposals.

Internal: Margy lands the job as Director of the Emmanuel Lutheran Day Care Center.

Contradiction: Continuing to plan for September and Quarter II. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Four-hundred fifty Mississippians attend statewide Town Meeting Assembly. Governor, Lt. Governor, Graciela Olivarez, national director of CSA; John Lewis, Dorothy Cotton, Barbara Sugarman of ACTION, and governor's office representatives attend. Roselyn Carter sends regrets from Vienna in letter to celebrate with Mississippians the importance of Town Meeting: Mississippi for the nation. Workshops reveal enormous explosion of activity in towns following Town Meetings. One-hundred fifty of next year's 250 events are planned and scheduled by participants with clear consensus that they will lead the meetings next year.

Internal: Nexus team comes for dignitary hosting with breakloose for next year's strategy. Celebration after Assembly at Ruth Wilson's home allows corporate expression of awe at finally seeing real mass awakenment and grasping a vision of more.

Contradiction: Finding a way to corporately debrief while all are rapidly dispersing and refocusing on GRA. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: A conference with Jim Stovall reveals that the new year's funding has been shifted to the new year's appropriation and contract signing must await the governor's signature.

Internal: Fourteen people, including four young Swedes who are excited about the Global Movement, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Creating the focus that pulls all loose ends together and working on it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mineral Wells, Mississippi TM #203, is filmed by Jones' New York film crew. House goes to Jackson, Mississippi for the state assembly where 450 are present. The day exceeds wildest expectations as communities witness and plan for future "beloved communities."

Internal: Fine celebration in Ruth Wilson's front yard allows exhilarated troops to reflect on the assembly and remember a fantastic year.

Contradiction: Ready Tennessee, Arkansas and Mississippi for next year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: CYF is held for Girl's Club in Eastlake and 55 attend to work on summer projects. GWF is held for Eastlake women with powerful impact. House picks up 3000 copies of annual report from Sears. Inkind contributions total to \$1500.

Internal: House disperses for Quarter I assignments: Michele Meyers and Bob Bolinbeck to visit family, youth to camp and Lynn to GRA. Local preschool director goes to GRA.

Contradiction: Putting things in place for the new summer thrust. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Firehouse restaurant completes first week of operation and grosses over \$2000. GWF is set in Maxton for October 13. Guild meeting elicits decisions to attend GRA and accept major responsibility for summer "Fabulous Fun Days."

Internal: House hosts 10 Jamaicans en route to GRA.

Contradiction: Establishing local economic enterprise without local on-going structures of sustenance. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The Central Florida maneuver is completed this week with three Town Meetings and a second assembly for a total of 18 events! City of Orlando sends \$100 for two neighborhood TMs. Hope Scott, local colleague, joins Joyce, Dennis and Amy to attend the Mississippi Assembly. A luncheon meeting with Orlando Area Director for Volunteer Services brings an invitation to do a demonstration Town Meeting next fall for their state assembly and positions ICA for state-wide cooperation through this network.

Internal: All four House members work full time to raise extra money so everyone will attend the GRA.

Contradiction: Strengthening the advantages coming out of Quarter IV's maneuvers in the brief time remaining before House leaves for the GRA and Council. (Wk. 1)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: The GRA concludes with presentation of documents from nine research task forces. Mezzanine transformation continues with hand crafted furniture from Kemper Carpentry Shop.

Internal: GRA celebrates the birth of Daniel Vijay to Tim and Rose Casswell on July 10th in London, the 60th birthday of Eugene Hunter from Widen HDP and the completed life of Juanita Vallejo from Asherton HDP on July 12th in Chicago.

Contradiction: Gathering all products from GRA into manageable form for decision making by the Global Priors Council. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Guests from several key funding sources attend commercial school graduation. CETA visit results in Training funds for next year. Truck receives safety certification.

Internal: Celebrations abound as Ryan Gilbert is baptized with a champaign breakfast.

Contradiction: Wrapping up the Miracle Month of May while creating images and structures for Quarter I. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and

shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Region sends six to the GRA. Troops make calls on the governors of Kansas and Nebraska who both promise cooperation with future state programs. Sixty people at four different gatherings view the Global Film.

Internal: Metro and House contract to paint a house in order to raise self support.

Contradiction: Imaging Quarter I as a discontinuous quarter while experiencing more intensity in everyday life. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Six events, including Town Meetings, social methods presentations, LENS seminar and others are held. A LENS seminar is submitted to Minnesota Department of Administration which leaves only one or two state departments which have not yet had a forum or seminar conducted by the ICA.

Contradiction: Keeping manpower coverants increasing at the same rate that the programs are booked in order to do a thorough job of impact and follow-up on all fronts. (Wk. 5)

Internal: House celebrates the forth of July with a backyard cookout.

Contradiction: Maintaining visible momentum with village maintenance and barnwood while preparing the crews for self-supervision. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Seventy-five people from 31 communities converge on Kinney for the first annual Local Communities on the Move Conference. Two hundred celebrate at the pig roast and dance that night. Sunday morning's reflection by excited new colleagues occasions mayor of Gilbert, Minnesota, (Kinney's Iron Range neighbor) to challenge "Hold the annual conference in Gilbert next year, and we'll show you a town on the move!" That same weekend, Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission grants \$7,600 to ICA for the Conference and follow-up.

External: Forty participate in House Church with Don Richards as celebrant to welcome him back from a year in Guatemala. A slide presentation follows the House Church.

Internal: House extends invitations to colleagues who can't make it to the GRA to participate as sojourners sometime during July.

Contradiction: Falling back on tried tactics rather than applying imaginal methods in doing GRA recruitment. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: A major addition to state frame comes with hour-long appointment with Indianapolis Mayor Bill Hudnut who opens by thanking ICA for taking time to see him and indicates willingness to provide active support for many ICA programs. Lafayette cadre uses year-end celebration as occasion to involve new contacts and send out recent Academy grad, Nancy Bain to staff sixth grad trip.

Internal: Paula Craddock brings Peru slides for a Saturday night sneak preview at House.

Contradiction: Creating an effective timeline and set of block club recruitment tactics to undergird Mapleton-Fall Creek stronghold early Quarter I. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: CYF date is set for Kentucky National Honors Society conference in Quarter II.

Internal: House completes relocation move with 15 colleagues and neighbors helping.

Contradiction: Keeping attention on the comprehensive mission while unpacking and settling in new facility. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Seven sent out to Global Research Assembly.

Internal: House outside painted by 20 in one day is seen as parish miracle.

Contradiction: Obtaining the needed authorization for umbrella funding. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: GRA recruitment and visitation is done geographically by turf teams.

Internal: Documentation of TM: Cleveland inspires House to reorganize files to tell the TM story.

Contradiction: Inspiring Metro Council participants to go to the GRA. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Chemical Bank members participate in a site visit of Loisaída, where the "Challenge for Those Who Dare" ask key questions and seek support in relation to the economic development of the Loisaída community.

Internal: Summer decor is put in place with Week II decor blitz which ends with a homemade pizza party.

Contradiction: Claiming the mundane tasks as the key victories. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House witnesses 2,000 people caring for Widen.

Internal: House celebrates independence day and Philippine-American Friendship Day with American steak and Philippino chicken.

Contradiction: Maintaining the urgency for setting up structures to care comprehensively for colleagues. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Development contacts 100 people in Buffalo. Global film is shown three times in region. Buffalo colleagues commit themselves to continue calling for third Buffalo Evening at the Institute at the end of the month.

Contradiction: Maintaining current positioning throughout Quarter I. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: The Ivy City Human Development Corporation has its first board meeting and nominates officers to serve until the first annual election.

Internal: House celebrates Independence Day with a collegium looking at Fredrick Douglas' Independence Day speech.

Contradiction: Drawing forth creativity from the community, volunteers and ourselves that will release the avalanche of miracles. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Community consenses on a five day per week Phase I program for the summer.

Internal: A birthday party and evening desserts put the House in a celebrative mood.

Contradiction: Determining the strategic moves to insure a solid economic foundation for the community. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Opportunities and framing for state campaign continue to motivate the House and the region.

Internal: Moving colleagues in and out of GRA releases new way to create and recreate house structures.

Contradiction: Sustaining constant motivation toward the future in the midst of follow-up. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Troops get out regional newsletter like clockwork at the beginning of the week. Region sends out eight people to the GRA.

Internal: Initiation of Quarter I begins with a great Pizza Party during week II.

Contradiction: Claiming the tasks as victory. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Woodshop in the old cornshop is now employing four community persons full-time with orders in excess of 10,000 waiting to be worked on. 500 wooden toilet tanks were made and shipped the first week of full time operation.

Internal: Two auxiliary, two community persons and one professional social worker from the state capital make up the GRA contingent as the home front picks 10 boxes of strawberries for House use.

Contradiction: Meeting demands of the mission with available resources. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: House makes village adoption presentation to Trinity Church in Shelburne Falls, Massachusetts. GRA phoning and

appointments continue. *Earthrise* pins are prepared for New York Area GRA contestants. ICA receives \$1640 in developed money.

Internal: House travels to New York City for May-Brock wedding.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

Internal: House space recreation produces new look and new organization.

Contradiction: Creating an image of engagement for local colleagues over the summer. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

Contradiction: Organizing people to see and places to go in the midst of everyone on vacation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sudbury 2001 Assembly draws over 100 people from 25 communities together to build coordinating tactics.

Internal: Women of House hold year-end celebration. Kids have barbecue in preparation for the shift to camp.

Contradiction: Setting fresh contexts for formulation that relate to presently felt local urgencies. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: The College of Professional Nurses invites Caracas ICA to do first all-Spanish Global Women's Forum. LENS procedures are translated by enthusiastic grads. In Cano Negro the industry storage shed is completed with cement roof and chapel into final phase of roof and doors.

Internal: Helen Worden, Becky Appenfelder, Trudi Mueller and Kathy Tomlinson stop on the way from Chile via Peruvian consult to give glowing report of Azpitia's first week.

Contradiction: Empowering secretariat and sector meetings from back of the room. (Wk. 1)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Form of loan fund is approved by community council and AID. Visit by director of Foundation Chile (ITT) Wayne Sandrig opens possibilities for further assistance. Ninos del Sol children's program fully staffed from the community.

Internal: Project celebration sends out Don and Mary Hopkins to South Dakota after their sabbatical year in Sol de Septiembre and Jose Luis back to Bananeiras after one month international interchange.

Contradiction: Reorienting our program administration from a 20-man auxiliary to an eight-man auxiliary in such a way that it intensifies community leadership. (Wk. 3)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Several hundred people gather from far and near to participate in Bananeiras' first year celebration with a children's parade, year's reports, singing groups, bon fire, food, dancing and a miniature hot air balloon which ascends into the night, its torch flaming, symbolizing Bananeiras future hopes.

Internal: Don and Mary Hopkins visit on way from Chile to the U.S.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum generated by celebration while keeping programs with staff going and coming in the next eight weeks. (Wk. 3)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Anniversary celebration erupts in week of work and wonder, highlighted by first-ever ecumenical service led by Cayman Islands ITI grad, Rev. Lawrence Small. All day assembly led by stake leaders and five simultaneous stake workdays produce four new flower gardens, three resurrected ones, and a grand day of celebration, including fair, banquet, sports and all night dance. Guests include diplomatic representation from three continents (UK, Australia and USA), local public and private sectors and ITI host committee.

Internal: Mervis Edwards returns from Azpitia Consult standing tall and filled with stories of victory.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in place for July and August during the next 10 days, while raising \$6000 to finance it all. (Wk. 13)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: House sends the Mexico Town Meeting team off with fireworks on July 4th. A large gathering crowds the INCAP building for a post-sector meetings send out of the TM crew. The Annual Report is completed. TOPKE places two technicians in the village. A workday focuses on latrine digging and nine holes are dug in Sector I.

Internal: Inga Bessin comes for one day enroute to Mexico City to help with TM and gives a fine report on Cano Negro.

Contradiction: Focusing wicker workers on their role as community leaders rather than only being responsible workers. (Wk. 3)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: Stake meetings start, English curriculum is written, well-baby clinic is held, streets are cleaned and road curve is leveled, BID proposal is written and translated, led and ink are delivered to printer, preschool uniforms are designed, first GCF training class is held, welcome signs are put up, fruit growing class is held and a village party releases appointment in Ministry of Interior.

Internal: Two new Azpitia sojourners join the House in time for a Peruvian guinea pig supper.

Contradiction: Completing the Project implementaries. (Wk. 3)
