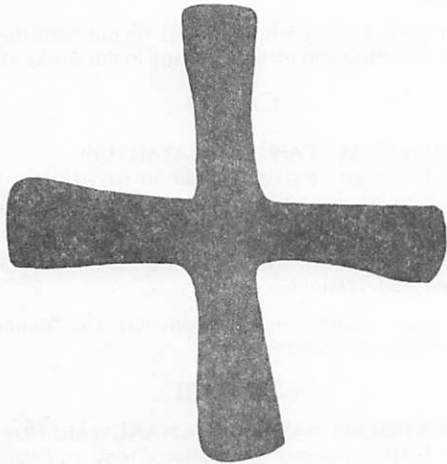

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Two CYFs are held with a local London school. Social is held to raise money for Powerhouse with \$600 profit, sponsored by local Sports Club. Kevin Ross, local colleague, raises \$320 in four days to come to GRA. Rose Caswell helps with Development calling.

Internal: Sojourner buys lawnmower at Petticoat Lane market place and wheels it five miles home, only to discover it doesn't work on the type of grass growing in Bridge House lawn.

Contradiction: Doing eight TMs per day while setting up 30 more. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Another Town Meeting is held and five more polises are set with 14 polises in the process of deciding. The India Blue Sari Mailing Maneuver nets four contributions totaling US\$80 with 46 outstanding to be accounted for.

Internal: The Hughes, a potential Guardian couple from Edinburgh, spend an evening with the House.

Contradiction: Sharpening phone set-up story to particularize time to match geography, while continuing mailings to shaky polises in order to be on 'call back death ground' to win (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: The Miracle Month of May begins with village entrance miracle—a new welcome sign, village directory, white stone road edging and repairs plus a beautiful new mural. Stake calls determine future miracles and line up muscle power.

Internal: House watches on TV the drama of the election of first woman head of government in the West.

Contradiction: Building momentum around Management Board to enable articulation of their victories. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meeting Jubilee reports 82 of 106 polises have

said yes to having TM; 11 are already held. The two and a half hour TM procedures and workbook are refined and printed. Key strategies are having three weeks in two, and dispersing the command post to the regions.

Internal: House ends first "week" with a candlelight dinner and launches the third "week" with a champagne breakfast.

Contradiction: Getting immediate decision from people who are used to planning one year ahead. (Wk. 9)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: All Day 1 troops are dispersed to continental Town Meeting campaign.

Internal: House hears continental report as context for doing rest of quarter adjustments.

Contradiction: Positioning House to maintain momentum. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Fifteen Development calls bring in US\$250 in-hand and 14 proposals accepted. Gottfried puts his expertise to work in the Termine industry. The street in front of the House is cobbled.

Internal: Guardians, Ruth and Paul Osborn, stop by on the way home from the Philippines bringing news from Manila.

Contradiction: Choosing the strategic door to go through when all doors are open. (Wk. 9)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Marathon management meeting and 15-strong community planning days symbolize emerging community iron, while news of inkind drums and borehole from Lever Brothers and Taylor Woodrow are received with glee. Larentis technical truck arrives and eight sweaty hours later streetlights blaze into

life again after Lenten pause. CIDA site visit impacts Director with Project seriousness.

Internal: A week of glorious victory is celebrated on the occasion of an auxiliary birthday with fabulous Chinese feast at Mr. K. P. Yu's house in the Nichemtex compound, and a romp in his swimming pool.

Contradiction: Setting arenas of responsibility concretely on the shoulders of leaders and employees. (Wk. 5)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus discovers that corporation calls for Town Meeting Development can be set-up by anyone using the corporate model.

Internal: Whole Nexus creates a situation report for the year, while future brooding through collegiums focuses attention on strongholds.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary corporate brooding on this year's victories and the year to come when the final steps require troops disbursement across the continent. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Four more polises have TMs. Three strongholds move forward with eventful meetings.

Internal: Corporate dynamic intensifies through daily remaneuvering and Saturday debriefing.

Contradiction: Formulating strategy for stronghold core engagement. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Brussels Area meets in remaneuvering session, celebrating the completion of *Dorpsdag* in all 36 Netherlands polises, and creating a plan for effective stronghold maneuvering in Belgium.

Internal: Extended family visit from Michigan includes a tripto Friesland which results in tracing the family back to the 1700's.

Contradiction: Recreating the long-range perspective in order to regain a sense of urgency toward the future. (Wk. 9)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Austrian (Pastor Golda) slips over the border, and Switzerland is "done." Great German Gamble team stays with Zeller family and reflection on profound happening of *Gemeindeforum* sparks their creating a one-year timeline for internship. With all German speakers on the road, permeators run training weekend in Frankfurt for volunteers who are going to work in Kenya Projects.

Internal: Great German Gamble team inkind printing of 300 German songbooks and social process triangles.

Contradiction: Creating the tricks that allow operating at a pace of 20 to 30 *Gemeindeforums* per week to be life-giving rather than a drain. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Town Meeting in Turkish community and Guardian Advisory Board meeting set the community spinning toward next catalytic steps. A House presentation to Greater Berlin Historic Church impacts larger community.

Internal: Ecclesiola with three community guests firmly grounds the "Wall of Wonder" and the descent into the valley.

Contradiction: Clarifying corporate images relative to the use of troops and time in catalyzing events. (Wk. 9)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Second visit by Ford Foundation confirms willingness to fund HDTs, Village Forums, and six additional villages in district in 1979-80.

Internal: Ecclesiola is again the highlight of the week, starting earlier and going later with the Beatitudes, Dunne and the Wall of Wonder.

Contradiction: Putting wheels on ITI recruitment this week with new brochure and mailing lists still in the works. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Entry sign is put up for Beautiful Bayad Bricks. Flower beds are planted around Stake 5 water station. Permission is granted to build community center in main medan (plaza).

Internal: House sends out to Nairobi HDTs Said Riskalla, Farah Hanna and Abdel Hamid.

Contradiction: Maintaining participation and momentum while seeking acceleration. (Wk. 9)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Feast of nations with national food and traditional dancing highlights the glorious week of awakening and the heritage excursion for the Human Development Training School in Kawangware. Visits to the national game park, the museum to view the origin of man, the national theater to see Kenyan struggle for independence, the Bomas of Kenya where traditional life is portrayed, the viewing the *Seven Faces of Dr. Lao* and the most fantastic Village Meeting hold the week.

Internal: Staff experiences the greatest night club in the world as the six tribal groupings from across the continent serve their festive dinner and dramatize their heritage in dances and song.

Contradiction: Giving form to that which creates the Iron Man on the African continent to care for the world. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Seventy percent of the community engages in completion of the pipe-line trench. The first three ferro-cement water jars (500 and 1,000 gallons) are completed in Stake 5.

Internal: Evening prayers are now taking deeper root in the House.

Contradiction: Transporting enough materials to build four water tanks per week in Stake 5. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Evening with the Institute, including global film showing, hosts representatives from World Bank, AID, Rotary Club and Madangeer Community Development Group. Three roads are bricked in Sikror. Mr. Manmohan Singh, Rural Development Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce, sets Development appointments. Stake meeting is held. One man is sent to HDTs. Deputy Panchayat Raj Officer visits village.

Internal: Laxmi and Vinod Yadav join Sikror auxiliary.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of change to summer style and mood rather than being slowed down by it. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTs which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Lunch with Robert and Elanor Welty, parents of Christina Clark, provides again the great gift of the Guardian dynamic. Mr. and Mrs. Welty plan to visit Sungai Lui where he was part of the Consult team two years ago.

Internal: Nexus welcomes Mauno Wilkkinen on world bicycle trek who left his home of Finland January, 1972 and plans to be gone until January, 1982.

Contradiction: Engaging futurically in a month of helpless waiting for decision on registration in Singapore. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Serusup experiences breakloose this week as handicraft center opens with 25 full-time workers working eight hours a day, six days a week. 1,000 chicks are finally on-site in Serusup. A sudden surge of daily stake work transforms the community as stakes prepare for next month's first anniversary celebration. *Serusup Syrakat Maju Jaya* (Serusup Community Company) holds its second Board of Directors meeting and discusses how shares will be distributed.

Internal: Auxiliary is impacted by corporate balloting of Panchayat at collegium.

Contradiction: Getting the young men of Serusup to see the village as their future. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Village meeting decides it is time to form a village company and elect the Secretariat in a village-wide meeting. Tutorial classes, increased with history and geography, are taught by youth. Village research teams go to Kuala Lumpur to check out getting fertilizer in bulk at wholesale, getting a rice mill, purchasing three more hand tractors for rice fields, and getting 10 typewriters on loan for a class of 20 who are waiting. Youth paint the inside and outside of agriculture complex, plow and level the surrounding area, pull weeds, and help plant 300 banana trees in the field behind. Site visit is made by a German fertilizer company which wants to do a demonstration plot. Johnson & Johnson grants US\$2,500.

Internal: Special visitors are Christina Clark's parents, Robert and Elanor Welty, who are impressed by the changes since Robert was here for the Consult and by the fact that the villagers remember him.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on village's new understanding that not only appointed leaders of the village can make decisions. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: House hosts number two man from USAID, Washington, D. C., for private voluntary organizations, together with Indonesian movie star who promises to help with handicraft training, and leading Indonesian newspaper for feature articles. Inkind victories of telex internationally, Indonesian phone calls, guest house rooms, lawyer for Indonesian Foundation (ICA), and architect for new community center are all well received from one plantation company.

Internal: House receives five interns who have finished two month sojourn period successfully.

Contradiction: Swirling economic possibilities until breakthrough to realizing ongoing jobs for villagers. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Old stage is removed to clear village entrance way for Panchayat visit. Bubun grid is moved to complement symbolism of House. Eight Department of Education officials open sewing class. Contact is made to arrange opening of mechanic training course. Guardians' meeting at the home of lumber tycoon brings 60 to hear Duffy and Epps talk about the global task.

Internal: Laiya and Sutiya have new baby girl not yet named.

Contradiction: Catalyzing rapid village involvement in creating visible signs without financial dependence. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Woman in Ujung Pandang inkinds four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Five villagers attend ecclesiola and participate fully.

Contradiction: Creating structures to use newly gained workshop skills in planning practical action. (Wk. 5)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: LENS is set up with Bank of America, American President Lines and U. S. Lines in Taiwan. Development and management treks are sent to Japan, Taiwan and the Philippines.

Internal: Nexus does helpful brooding on future in sodality and summer collegium (PSU).

Contradiction: Keeping future open while taking full responsibility for the present. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Dental clinic plumbing and electricity is completed and printer donates printing of advertisements without even being asked. One of the elderly women performs a solo in nationwide singing contest for the elder. One elder and one youth complete two more visa applications to visit the Hai Ou Project.

Internal: The week's focus on summer brooding via constructs covers a host of concerns across the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Covering Project and region responsibly in the summer when many villagers and staff will be away. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: YMCA requests TM. Steel bars for House are delivered. Land is cleared and foundation ready for digging. Penny Tung (past city president) visits and fifteen are impressed by Hai Ou's development.

Internal: Bruce Macomber visits and participates in second anniversary celebration planning.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the practical next steps for expanding Hai Ou enterprises. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Major Development grants are approved for Mactan Cluster Projects. References by Cebu local people who know and work with Projects are key to 127,000 pesos in April—a record month. An electric generator is purchased for Langub. Multiple drug association contacts reveal desire to engage locally. Request for Mountain Cluster consultants for Magtuod, La Pax, Carmen and New Valencia Projects gets enthusiastic response from many companies.

Internal: *The Deer Hunter* seen in Asian situation is radical address.

Contradiction: Putting together a package of programs that launch a new era. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Taipei metro colleagues contribute money toward India Development request. Taiwan bi-regional meeting of Taipei and Hong Kong Houses sees global film and reveals common grasp of local man's vision and contradictions, enabling first corporate brooding on land-wide imperatives. Taiwan Cement Corporation donates 250 bags of cement to the new facility in Hai Ou.

Internal: House studies Guardians Consult talk *The Life of Service*.

Contradiction: Breaking loose and utilizing new and old Guardian relationships in the economic sector of the government. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: "Picking Up Pesos" Maneuver hits high gear as rattan workers shoot up from 28 to 78 and all 13 industries accomplish month goal for Cluster of 5900 pesos per week of gross income, a week before deadline. HDTS does a forum in each Sudtonggan stake in the midst of leaving for heritage trip. Five preschools reopen and submit proposal to Lions Club Council for support of all five. USAID head man visits. High point of week is rotating purok TV that draws huge crowds.

Internal: House hears Kenya report from Hezekiah Odyambo and then escapes to movie *The Great Escape*.

Contradiction: Spending time on digging the long tunnel for a great corporate win. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: House sends out 58 participants to the HDTS from the five villages in the Mountain Cluster. The tractor arrives and starts plowing 30 hectares, 2,500 feet of pipe is laid and the water system is turned on bringing regular water to the mountain top for the first time. Davao City sends 20 truckloads of gravel for the Langub road.

Internal: Global Panchayat visits and tours four new Projects in the first vehicle to make it completely across the mountain ridge trail.

Contradiction: Getting everything ready for the four Consults. (Wk. 6)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Thirty attend an incredible national Guardians meeting. Eight come as official representatives of companies. Three new TM sponsors sign up: Cathay Pacific Airline (1,000,000 yen in tickets), AFIA Insurance and Seven-Up. National Jaycee executive director will help promote TM in 640 chapters.

Internal: Student sojourners begin to lead House meals after a training collegium.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of how to leap from 100 Town Meetings to 1000 Town Meetings. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Common grain mill opening celebration date is set and first equipment secured. House hosts nightly practice of women's village choir for village singing contest next week. Lee Jae Joon participates in Seoul facility search.

Internal: Buddha's birthday is occasion for total House journey to Sam Bong San shrine with five colleagues to enjoy outing.

Contradiction: Moving from "wishing something would happen" to corporate model building with the village that enables practical tactics toward completion. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Visit with new head of Saemaul Movement (roughly undersecretary for national community development) reveals collegueship and decision to spend three days visiting North American ICA Projects and Chicago Nexus in May.

Internal: Mobile House takes unwanted form as second move in three weeks is prepared and two colleagues await move into House pending a facility large enough to hold them.

Contradiction: Keeping up with the vision of what the ICA is about. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Last leg of Projects's first year features museum completion, stocking of health center, bathhouse and

barbershop opening and planting of 1350 trees. Two hundred, including provincial governor, attend performance of village agricultural band and feast of common piggery sow that miscarried.

Internal: Miss Lee is welcomed as two-month sojourner to serve as nurse in health center until July sojourn in Chicago.

Contradiction: Seeing the army of supporters. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House reflects on a new model for doing its share of the 1000 TMs that Japan will hold in the next 12 months. House enhances the decor for upcoming meetings using the TM symbols from successful past meetings reports.

Internal: Beth Ziegenmier marches in Don Taku (Merchant's Festival) Parade for Spring Festivities in the city attended by nearly two and one half million people.

Contradiction: Uncovering the win with new village in Okinawa for the globe. (Wk 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: It is an exciting framing and Development week with a total of 27 appointments in Osaka, Nagoya and Kobe. At the Tuesday night dinner, reports and global film showing, about 25 people of many differing relations to ICA are present and linger long to continue talking. One businessman is on his way to Philippine Consults in early June. Sushila and Kathy host women volunteers and friends in a fine showing of the film and ways to participate.

Internal: A Saturday night addressing party (pizza celebration) brings old files up-to-date, adds new names to mailing list, and prepares for mailing of first national newsletter.

Contradiction: Keeping focus on Town Meeting successes and moving full force to complete TM maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: House sets dates for key Town Meeting in Urakawa, Hokaido, where representatives of the town will meet for in-depth meeting of seven hours.

Internal: Garden is planted in workday with community.

Contradiction: Budgeting time effectively. (Wk. 8)

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Whole House attends Area Council in Melbourne where Russel Brown is assigned to Murrin Bridge Industry Sydney liaison. Pat Weygandt and Margaret Oakley stay for the two-week Tasmania CMA campaign, and Barbara Brown, Barry Oakley, Alice Wright and Mike Hoff are assigned to the ICA audit for the three weeks. A CMA is set for Broken Hill, New South Wales, and Development gathers in Sydney to push public and private framing and funding in New South Wales.

Internal: The Order celebrates the internship of Debbie Farley, an RS-1 grad who has been on the CMA circuit for three months.

Contradiction: Igniting the strategies through a transrational model that holds all the avenues of doing the three campaigns within the Sydney Region. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Panchayat visit brings together old and new colleagues for a great film night, reignites local Guardian support and elicits referral for Salani from Samoan clergyman.

Internal: Miracles performed by local colleagues as they invite guests, prepare the House and fill the fridge with food, in readiness for the Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Demonstrating the presence of the Perth House while troops are deployed on other fronts. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Colleagues attending Panchayat visit event are excited by meeting Toronto Guardians Ann and David Patterson, and seeing global film and slides of Murrin Bridge shown by local Guardian Dr. John Murchland. Seven more Community Meetings are done in midst of which House discovers host committee chairman from CM held in Pt. Pirie three years ago holding great forums in his district.

Internal: *Way of All the Earth* study is a highlight of Panchayat visit, affirming what House is about.

Contradiction: Configuring troops to sustain them in the area mission with three more state campaigns still to go. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: House completes 35 Community Meetings in Tasmania with 206 participants. Highlight is Week II signals check at Bronte Park Challet near Cradle Mountain—for the total cost of \$30 for three nights for 10 people, with wood for the stove thrown in for free.

Internal: Melbourne House sends books to Sydney for Australian audit. New national brochure tides out public face.

Contradiction: Formulating a practical vision of the future clearly enough to build implementaries. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: Australian Development Assistance Bureau announces it will give \$10,000 Australian to Salani HDP. Garnet Banks, Marge Tomlinson and Liza Tod arrive home from Tasmanian CMA campaign and two leave for Queensland.

Internal: Bill Goodger from Richgrove HDP visits Canberra House during his International Veterinary Congress and then goes to Murrin Bridge taking three other vets from Denmark, Canada and West Australia.

External: House raises \$1,500 in 24 hours to get Queensland circuiters on the road. Eight troops invade House to launch awakenment campaign. Three teams begin treks that will cover 12,000 miles in three weeks (equal to driving from Sydney to Chicago).

External: Health Commission workers visit Project for baseline data regarding health grant, amidst swirling youth activities during week of term holidays. Youth renovate double garage for their club house, and make two tables. Toddlers tea party introduced on Hope Richardson's first birthday, as indirect preventive health tactic is held in community resident's house with newly tiled kitchen floor.

Internal: A week of guests establishes old contacts, which broadens net of authorization.

Contradiction: Getting ready for the first waltz. (Wk. 8)

## SUVA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: House moves to forming 1979-1980 both in the Majuro Metro and Area Suva by initiating work on the proposal to be used in negotiating the second \$900,000.

Internal: "Sing-along" with Singapore Nexus Development Centrum for the first time adds new impetus and increases repertoire.

Contradiction: Uncovering new avenues of relationship to the new establishment. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: The village experiences relatedness to the globe and HDPs through viewing the global film at the Mormon Church, where the only generator in town is located. Contradiction: Creating the corporate context in the midst of being scattered by task assignments. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Hard work and sweat all week produces Week II with a variety of miracles including landscaping the plaza with approximately \$400 of inkind plants, arrival of laundromat washers and dryers, education module which produces day camp curriculum for summer, and flea market continues to be Sunday event in the community.

Internal: House self-support begins with Ken Filipski's job at \$14,000 per year and finishes with beginnings of House garden.

Contradiction: Releasing people to take on long-lasting circuit responsibility. (Wk. 9)

External: Nine community youth paint ceiling of youth center. Thirteen guests from Seattle House, Vancouver House and Chicago explode workday and lay out impact awakening events.

Contradiction: Catapulting regional, House and Project interchange into regional explosion. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Regional Council called "The Time of our Lives," a retreat for those who care, combines review of freedom and church sections of RS-1 with seminary and sodality from first three weeks of ecclesiola and six of the Beatitudes conversations and gets largest turnout all year. Regional

planning is accomplished in shortest time ever after Week II of depth contexting and perspective. Highlight is Daily Office and baptism of Elizabeth Mariko Robertson as rehearsal of covenant is reexperienced by all.

Internal: Reports from Area and Guardians meetings and ecclesiola study which looks at the prolegemena from Consult documents reground doing.

Contradiction: Getting missional contradiction articulated with clarity which can focus the new-found advantages from the film showings and the Regional Council. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

All districts are touched by circuits.

Internal: Dispersed House establishes outposts with Religious House packs, and studies the *Life of Service* paper.

Contradiction: Developing the second wave of troops through strategic orchestration of time and distance. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Creating tactical actions within permeation assignments during Merry Month of May. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Day care director, Evangeline Fast Horse, receives her B.A. in education at ceremonies in Bismarck Civic Center. Impact visits solidify one LENS with two more working and a pending decision for GWF. Construction toward the multi-purpose ball court begins as court location is graded.

Internal: One acre House garden is plowed and corn and potatoes are planted.

Contradiction: Impacting the spirit of corporate action toward program development. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Positioning shapes up with phone contacts with Casper, Wheatland, Lusk, Torrington (all in Wyoming) and Boulder and Fort Collins, Colorado, as well as the Colorado Lt. Governor and CSA. Guardian-led pledge campaign of 50 pledges by June wins two new pledgers with Carl Mueller delivering his at his first Denver House Church.

Internal: A garage sale on Saturday raises \$438.62 in self-support.

Contradiction: Creating practical, do-able deeds out of a host of good ideas. (Wk. 9)

### **EDMONTON**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Two men go on key visits in order to complete funding proposals for portable sawmill and dump truck operation.

Internal: Focusing weekly collegiums in leadership development reveals great potential and produces a training design.

Contradiction: Staging the events and contacts of this week in order to build momentum for Panchayat visit at end of week. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER**

External: The Vancouver House participates in a regional/areal interchange by sending two to the Custer Town Meeting and five House people plus a regional colleague to the Cusick workday this Week II. In the Local Recruitment Maneuver, appointments set rises to 20, plus a slide show is scheduled with four directors of the YWCA.

Internal: Inking continues to aid self-support with five pounds of sausages, seven pounds of chicken, twenty five sandwiches, and a promise of a large number of hamburger patties.

Contradiction: Maintaining laser beam detachment to stay on top of five qualityawakenment events while prepping ten other TMs for next week. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Northeast Mississippi Town Meetings move along on schedule with four TMs and one CYF. The old tough towns like Byhalia plan for great events this month. LENS appointments are set in Memphis.

Contradiction: Fascinating TWC with all the possibilities of this moment while planning the fall maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Global Women's Forum delivers depth and new collegiality to Louisville stronghold as bank vice-president and CETA staff, black block club leaders and white executives' wives discover their common ground as Those Who Care. Twenty-two bi-metro colleagues gather to do initial strategy on next year's maneuvers followed by House Church sending out a team of four to Peru Consult and welcoming back three from Mill Shoals and Fifth City.

Contradiction: Acting on the promise of the rainbow in the midst of the hailstorm of contingency. (Wk. 8)

Internal: The Dunne study of Chapter 5 allows the House to see individual journeys as part of the journey of history concretely.

Contradiction: Swirling multiple foci into one powerful focus which brings House into fall. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Parents of Little Peep Play Group lead a community workday in painting the Peep House, then proceed to form an alliance with the church women's club which is all Phase IV.

Internal: The first Development circuit in the life of the Project uncovers and updates old Institute friends and raises money.

Contradiction: Getting the group of leaders to name itself and corporately assume its role of responsibility for the community. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Eleven Development appointments are set up by visiting area team, David Dunn and Linda Vernoy. Cocktail party with slide show is held for interested office contacts. Further work is done on State of Connecticut Town Meeting proposal. Summer packet is sent to area houses.

Internal: House and visiting team see *Manhattan* starring Woody Allen and identify with struggle between integrity, rationality and possibility.

Contradiction: Coordinating local, area and regional activities so that the future doesn't become the past before action is taken. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. Cambridge Town Meeting, Binghamton Town Meeting assembly and Albany Metro debriefing wind up quarter's Town Meeting campaign with two clusters of events held and one Assembly yet to go.

Internal: Looking ahead to next quarter through collegiums on "Ten Considerations in Community Reformulation" and quarter vision enables nonchalance with core and releases their creativity.

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: The executive director of a New Hampshire Human Services Coordinating Council says yes to a series of TMs in the fall.

Internal: Clean-up of the mini-park adjacent to the House catalyzes the participation by next door neighbor.

Contradiction: Working through a campaign night GSF dynamic without getting stuck in a particular structure. (Wk. 5)

**MONTREAL**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Many missional activities come into clearer focus as House experiences Panchayat visit, calls on a Greek Orthodox priest to firm up the date for a GWF and plans and executes a French slide presentation and soiree.

Internal: The "faithful remnant" is reduced to two as the Robins are sent out on the Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Maximizing effective use of little time remaining until Week 10 GWF while internally maintaining corporate glue. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Twelve LENS appointments are made in one week, and all interested. Forum meeting with East York agencies and youth set for June 13, and meetings in Halton with school trustees reveal interest in CYF.

Internal: Dr. and Mrs. Johnson come for House Church and witness on new global church and show slides on the Peoples' Republic of China.

Contradiction: Taking quick advantage of Toronto's role of major pivot city in nation and globe. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: First visits are made in Ottawa Valley to renew acquaintances and begin saturation push as preparation for HDP, and in North Leeds to begin Global Servant Force Campaign. Sudbury continues to grow like topsy with training/demonstration and forums held this week.

Internal: New dryer is donated.

Contradiction: Creating strategies that emphasize human development. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Celebration of end of Consult month on Monday night encourages reflection and resolve for leadership cadre. Regional leadership indicates willingness to come to Lorne for parts of this month, also.

Internal: Community decision to lead causes House to work on shifting images from gunning Project programs to training Samurai warriors.

Contradiction: Building rhythms, completing legal back-up, thinking through journey models before the kairotic moment of cadre commitment moves. (Wk. 7)

**CARACAS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: *Abisto* (community store) is granted sugar and rice donation and meat at discount prices. All chapel walls and

columns are completed with enthusiastic work force taking assignment by days.

Internal: Rosi Meyberg visits Cano Negro again on her way back to Brazil.

Contradiction: Continuing with momentum and preparing all programs for self-sufficiency as troops diminish one by one. (Wk. 9)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Largest community meeting in many months is attended by 75 from community, guests from USAID and Peace Corps, to discuss land issue and community land sites. Draft of budget for first draw on AID grant is submitted. Helen Haug is sent out to Lima auxiliary. Construction begins on new village entrance with formation of new construction company.

Internal: Activation of Guardian network in Santiago has women participating in calls for sewing industry donations and collection of used shoes for village children.

Contradiction: Capturing opportunity of AID grant to set up management training without committing people in community to jobs they can't handle. (Wk. 9)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: The second week of the ITI brings a busload of participants for a workday and barbeque in Bananeiras HDP. Mother/infant course focuses on curative and preventative medicines available in the community. Banana growers from the mountains travel by burro to bring results of survey which seeks to improve banana transport.

Internal: Hosting ITI and community to backyard barbeque breaks loose all-out House cleaning, decorating, chicken coop creation and shiny pots.

Contradiction: Turning scattered community participation into intentional ongoing activity participation. (Wk. 9)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: National Commercial Bank agrees to "being on the hook" for IADB loan, and to help train local loan committee. Development banks \$1,100 Jamaican. Noel and Verlene attend synods of three denominations for ITI recruitment. Tool pool management training is completed.

Internal: Easter discontinuity allows repainting guest room and collegium floor, and all return with resurrected vision.

Contradiction: Launching a quarter that has already begun. (Wk. 5)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, inkind push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Internal: Access to nearby telephone simplifies Development calling and Saturday barhopping celebration with cadre colleague provides encounter with Peruvian folk music.

Contradiction: Dealing with inadequate practical arrangements in the face of ever-mounting missional demands. (Wk. 6)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports that CSA assigns forms to complete grant application and assigns Project monitor. A 102,000 peso grant is picked up in one day in Manila. Forty-one corporation appointments are set in Frankfurt, Brussels and London. The breakthroughs are in the arena of major funding with openings in major businesses, including Germany, Belgium and entrees into the Chinese community in Manila through Chinese Rockefellers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of sustaining necessary funding through the summer.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports that First International Ecumenical Conference on the Meaning of Human Suffering creates shocking insights on the state of the Church as it relates to the world today. John Dunne site visit creates occasion for fine Nexus event and dialogue. The ICA annual report moves toward completion, an extraordinary Phase I campsite for summer releases curriculum planning, and significant work on retreat and modules in the field enlightens the edge. Implosions are set off by article, "Revolution in the Village," as collegium data begins to roll in from the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the underlying common standpoint of the mission in order to focus the summer effectively.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports four Village Meetings are held around Serusup with outstanding participation from local headmen. Brussels Nexus is represented at Benelux polis coverage, U.K. polis coverage and HDP acceleration. Luncheon at Chicago Nexus for wives of Swiss and German Consul Generals results in film event set for International Women's Club and women of consulate corps, and GWF set for Septemer. GSD post updates Chicago's tracking board and discovers solid economic victories in two-thirds of the HDPs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of raising corporately the deepest questions about the one thrust that will launch us into the future.

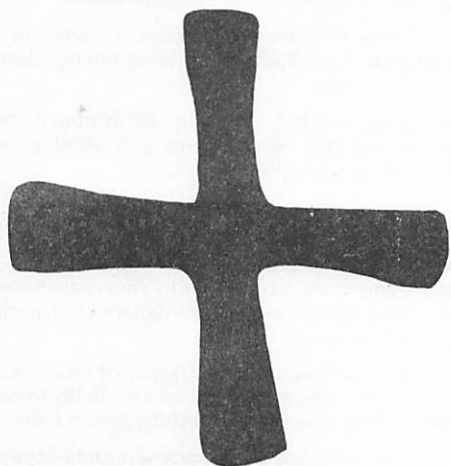
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

External: Two CYFs are held with a local London school. Social is held to raise money for Powerhouse with \$600 profit, sponsored by local Sports Club. Kevin Ross, local colleague, raises \$320 in four days to come to GRA. Rose Caswell helps with Development calling.

Internal: Sojourner buys lawnmower at Petticoat Lane market place and wheels it five miles home, only to discover it doesn't work on the type of grass growing in Bridge House lawn.

Contradiction: Doing eight TMs per day while setting up 30 more. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional colleague assists in the orchestration of Ayr mid-day TM for the golding of the polis. The region gears up for seven more TMs in Week 8 engaging a host of regional colleagues with completion of all polis assured.

Internal: Adam Thompson injects the reality of the Area TM Jubilee maneuver into the region and House is profoundly effected by the Joseph Campbell *Earthrise* paper in collegium.

Contradiction: Articulating and rehearsing the learnings of this campaign in order to share them with the globe. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TA'RGWAITH HDP

External: The Miracle Month of May begins with village entrance miracle—a new welcome sign, village directory, white stone road edging and repairs plus a beautiful new mural. Stake calls determine future miracles and line up muscle power.

Internal: House watches on TV the drama of the election of first woman head of government in the West.

Contradiction: Building momentum around Management Board to enable articulation of their victories. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Town Meeting Jubilee campaign begins to produce as six TMs are done during the week. Fresh networks

Contradiction: Maximizing telephoning time in the midst of TM orchestration demands. (Wk. 10)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Maneuvers on five French regions are initiated by the showing of the global film to key authorization figures (CNJA, UNESCO, ICA President/lawyer). Ford: France agrees to print TM report. Brochure for la Chesne stronghold is created and sent, as well as a training construct for the Dijon CNJA (National Center for Young Agriculturalists).

Internal: House welcomes Clare Mathiot, Dominique's sister, before sending her to a week of Town Meeting circuits in Belgium.

Contradiction: Using Day II time effectively. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Order arrives for 36 more market umbrellas for export. Chairs are ready to assemble. Development raises US\$1,750 from one order. Invitations are sent out to 50 Superior Generals for meeting with Dr. Vanistendael next week. Jesuit and American Embassy letters of authorization are on the way.

Internal: Father Fernando Abalos and three Sisters of the Sacred Heart from Boston visit Termine for Sunday House Church.

Contradiction: Finding a house to live in the village after May 31. (Wk. 10)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Three major companies accept contracts with sewing

industry for orders, breaking through the contracts contradiction. Two professional primary health care workers visit Ijede to recruit two for training. Mud pit for borehole drilling is plastered with concrete. Ijede Community Industries Articles and memorandum are combed by three auxiliary, a lawyer and a management consultant.

Internal: Announcement of the visit of the duty officer of the Secretary to the Lagos state government during the past week augments awe of study at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Changing the "if you produce, we'll produce" mentality into "Let's move." (Wk. 10)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus involvement in Belgium strongholding sets the battlefield mood on the edge of the continental focus.

Internal: Rev. Ted Berthold from the local Holy Trinity Church attends ecclesiola and only leaves ten minutes before his church's Annual General Meeting is due to begin.

Contradiction: Configuring troops to close this year and prepare for next. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Four more polises have TMs. Three strongholds move forward with eventful meetings.

Internal: Corporate dynamic intensifies through daily remaneuvering and Saturday debriefing.

Contradiction: Formulating strategy for stronghold core engagement. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Work begun on National Report reveals three major arenas of concern to local man in the Netherlands. Student at Delft University who speaks Spanish reads ad in school paper and calls to say he is available for GSD work as water engineer.

Internal: Mrs. James Mathews (wife of Bishop Mathews) impacts House with ICA history and the globe.

Contradiction: Turning latent interest in GSD into active giving of technical expertise to the globe. (Wk. 10)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Lissau family provides housing for three on the Great German Gamble and takes team on evening tour of Munich for appropriate beginning of "The Munich Monopoly". "Stuttgart Shuffle" is finished in time for a side trip to Vienna. On one hour's notice, Johannes Bruckner goes with Blase to orchestrate Gemeindeforum steering committee meeting—planning for a three-day community festival, including old-time full day Gemeindeforum in June.

Internal: Blase manages half day off from work to be the non-German speaker who can phone and sneak past secretaries in making Development appointments with big bosses.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same momentum in the last days of the campaign knowing that the "finish line" is in reality the new "starting gate". (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Exciting workday on renovating space for new children's program and facade of model apartment house establishes new physical signs in the community toward a new future.

Internal: Roger Williams participates in third Kreuzberg Ost Guardian meeting representing needed global presence.

Contradiction: Developing local consensus on both the upcoming flea market and future Project finance structures. (Wk. 10)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Eight community women in poultry program, four midwives, and two tractor drivers are sent out for government training program while 15 attend HDTs in Nairobi. Piggery is in full operation with three sows and one boar, while poultry foundation is prepared. Keystone maneuvering gives fresh focus to Quarter IV. Grader moves in to begin terracing 20 acre irrigated farm—a key economic step for Kapini.

Internal: Three Catholic Aspirants in training are assigned eight months to the KHDP by Archbishop Milingo during Good Friday visit to Project.

Contradiction: Enabling the traditional symbolic, the landed established and the new, emerging leadership with new decision making roles. (Wk. 10)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Cement and palm fiber roof sheet passes the 130 plus kilo test, giving the full steam ahead signal for full production as buyers knock on door.

Internal: ICA and Project support flows in the form of an inkind pickup truck, five new staff members and ability to cover food and stipends with new English teaching jobs in Cairo.

Contradiction: Enabling the government and village people to be effective in utilizing time to actualize needed plans. (Wk. 10)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Engagement lab of HDTs is outstanding event of the week where participants decide that maneuvers can be "friends" and the building of them is exciting. Historical meeting with Elder Kabiro and his first-born son opens door to doing the village of Kabiro with his support and participation.

Internal: One participant states, "I understand now that all is possible." He is part of the management systems strike force.

Contradiction: Doing future planning for area and Project as all are engaged full-time in doing HDTs. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Seventy percent of the community engages in completion of the pipe-line trench. The first three ferro-cement water jars (500 and 1,000 gallons) are completed in Stake 5.

Internal: Evening prayers are now taking deeper root in the House.

Contradiction: Transporting enough materials to build four water tanks per week in Stake 5. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Site selection is accomplished for the 75 Projects, and the third draw of the first installment of the EEC grant is received, pushing a long way toward the completion of the 232.

Internal: A week of collegiums in preparation for the GRA and the CRA (Continental Research Assembly) prove to be a great advantage toward the future of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between bolstering the 232 and moving into the 2500. (Wk. 10)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Evening with the Institute, including global film showing, hosts representatives from World Bank, AID, Rotary Club and Madangeer Community Development Group. Three roads are bricked in Sikror. Mr. Manmohan Singh, Rural Development Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce, sets Development appointments. Stake meeting is held. One man is sent to HDTS. Deputy Panchayat Raj Officer visits village.

Internal: Laxmi and Vinod Yadav join Sikror auxiliary.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of change to summer style and mood rather than being slowed down by it. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTS which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Lunch with Robert and Elanor Welty, parents of Christina Clark, provides again the great gift of the Guardian dynamic. Mr. and Mrs. Welty plan to visit Sungai Lui where he was part of the Consult team two years ago.

Internal: Nexus welcomes Mauno Wilkkinen on world bicycle trek who left his home of Finland January, 1972 and plans to be gone until January, 1982.

Contradiction: Engaging futurically in a month of helpless waiting for decision on registration in Singapore. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Five-day Imaginal Education course in Serusup for health educators and preschool teachers attracts all guilds at various times during the week. Sunday night leadership meeting draws 25 adults, and major issues concerning the Serusup Company are decided. Community struggles with taking responsibility for ratan industry when three young men decide to take other jobs out of Serusup.

Internal: House gets in fish farm truck and celebrates ecclesiola outside of House at Malay restaurant.

Contradiction: Designing the weekly time design that draws full participation in all Project activities, now that economic ventures are in full swing. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: The district officer makes a public announcement at a gathering in front of State of Selangor officials that "Sungai Lui is an example villages for the whole state." This catalyzes the village toward an unprecedented unity of action symbolized by a village planning meeting with active Project participants along with village political bodies after the headman's statement that "from now on this village is going to work together no matter what because we are doing this Project for the whole State of Selangor." Sanitation Department inspects latrines (40 more, 20 more to go) and offers two bags of cement, pipe and seat free. Group of 4-H youth clear jungle for planting corn. All preschoolers get a new T-shirt. Two villagers deal with the practics of getting lorry licensing themselves for the first time.

Internal: Bamboo split into halves and placed flush makes House fence admired by villagers.

Contradiction: Reeducating freedom as the responsibility of "we're it." (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: House hosts number two man from USAID, Washington, D. C., for private voluntary organizations, together with Indonesian movie star who promises to help with handicraft training, and leading Indonesian newspaper for feature articles. Inkind victories of telex internationally, Indonesian phone calls, guest house rooms, lawyer for Indonesian Foundation (ICA), and architect for new community center are all well received from one plantation company.

Internal: House receives five interns who have finished two month sojourn period successfully.

Contradiction: Swirling economic possibilities until breakthrough to realizing ongoing jobs for villagers. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Old stage is removed to clear village entrance way for Panchayat visit. Bubun grid is moved to complement symbolism of House. Eight Department of Education officials open sewing class. Contact is made to arrange opening of mechanic training course. Guardians' meeting at the home of lumber tycoon brings 60 to hear Duffy and Epps talk about the global task.

Internal: Laiya and Sutiya have new baby girl not yet named.

Contradiction: Catalyzing rapid village involvement in creating visible signs without financial dependence. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Agriculture module is set for Week 8, with consent of Dick Wet to attend. Preparation continues with farmer's meetings, inking of handbooks on planting crops and consultation with agricultural services. Kacamatan (county) is golded on Saturday night at celebration, with the last two of 18 village TMs completed. All 18 are done by villagers in the last two months.

Contradiction: Spinning more than one plate and going the distance. (Wk. 10)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Bruce Bauknight returns from mid-quarter management audit check in Sudtonggan which coincides with the great cluster council ending the second Sudtonggan HDTS. NT\$400,000 and six tons of steel roll into Hai Ou and Taipei to continue work on the center under construction.

Internal: Week of comings and goings includes sending Ken Hamje off to the Mountain Cluster Consults, highlighted by a pizza and beer celebration.

Contradiction: Pushing towards a new facility now in the midst of preparing for July and the newness on the other side of Global Order Council. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Dental clinic plumbing and electricity is completed and printer donates printing of advertisements without even being asked. One of the elderly women performs a solo in nationwide singing contest for the elder. One elder and one youth complete two more visa applications to visit the Hai Ou Project.

Internal: The week's focus on summer brooding via constructs covers a host of concerns across the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Covering Project and region responsibly in the summer when many villagers and staff will be away. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: YMCA requests TM. Steel bars for House are delivered. Land is cleared and foundation ready for digging. Penny Tung (past city president) visits and fifteen are impressed by Hai Ou's development.

Internal: Bruce Macomber visits and participates in second anniversary celebration planning.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the practical next steps for expanding Hai Ou enterprises. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Major Development grants are approved for Mactan Cluster Projects. References by Cebu local people who know and work with Projects are key to 127,000 pesos in April—a record month. An electric generator is purchased for Langub. Multiple drug association contacts reveal desire to engage locally. Request for Mountain Cluster consultants for Magtuod, La Pax, Carmen and New Valencia Projects gets enthusiastic response from many companies.

Internal: *The Deer Hunter* seen in Asian situation is radical address.

Contradiction: Putting together a package of programs that launch a new era. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Area Hong Kong Development team coordinates effort to set up five LENS courses for September and October for single companies, such as American President Lines and the Bank of America. Control Data comes through with 1979 donation of almost US\$2,000—largest single gift thus far in Taiwan. House meets chairman of the board and president of Bristol-Meyers world-wide at reception to honor company's expansion in Taiwan. Presentations to Lions Club are held in three counties. ICA *Up-Date* news is mailed to 200 key supporters and contributors.

Internal: Study of Joseph Campbell's *Earthrise, Dawning of a New Spiritual Consciousness* is very helpful complement to Dunne's book.

Contradiction: Designing regular circuits to break open metro strongholds. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan Cluster economic fair preparation roars into high gear with inking of prizes: weighing scales, calculators, village clocks, trophies, volleyballs, basketballs and US\$650. T-shirts for five villages and banners gear up villages in midst of try-outs for village contestants in dance, song, watermelon, tug-of-war and beer drinking contests. Cluster preschool directors give lecture and panel discussion for Imaginal Educational section of HDTS. Fifty-three more sign up for rattan as all economic goals are met.

Internal: House welcomes colleague from Suva, Rick Jones, who visits briefly with Marshallese HDTS participants.

Contradiction: Holding the total picture of the year while allowing tunnel vision for particular events. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: House sends out 58 participants to the HDTS from the five villages in the Mountain Cluster. The tractor arrives and starts plowing 30 hectares, 2,500 feet of pipe is laid and the water system is turned on bringing regular water to the mountain top for the first time. Davao City sends 20 truckloads of gravel for the Langub road.

Internal: Global Panchayat visits and tours four new Projects in the first vehicle to make it completely across the mountain ridge trail.

Contradiction: Getting everything ready for the four Consults. (Wk. 6)

## TOKYO

Internal: Student sojourners begin to lead House meals after a training collegium.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of how to leap from 100 Town Meetings to 1000 Town Meetings. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANG YUNG IL HDP

External: A group of 150 Kwang Yung Il villagers participate in Aewol Sub-County Parents Day celebration and see the women's association win an encouragement prize as the only small village choir singing. Special Assistant to Minister of Health and Social Affairs visits and requests ICA participation in a provincial council for development. Possible stronghold sites are visited.

Internal: House hosts guests including the director of the Development Research Institute, the Saemaul newspaper, the Rural Development Institute, local pastors and prospective sojourners.

Contradiction: Struggling to harness corporate leadership of village. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Visit with new head of Saemaul Movement (roughly undersecretary for national community development) reveals collegialship and decision to spend three days visiting North American ICA Projects and Chicago Nexus in May.

Internal: Mobile House takes unwanted form as second move in three weeks is prepared and two colleagues await move into House pending a facility large enough to hold them.

Contradiction: Keeping up with the vision of what the ICA is about. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Last leg of Projects's first year features museum

completion, stocking of health center, bathhouse and barbershop opening and planting of 1350 trees. Two hundred, including provincial governor, attend performance of village agricultural band and feast of common piggery sow that miscarried.

Internal: Miss Lee is welcomed as two-month sojourner to serve as nurse in health center until July sojourn in Chicago.

Contradiction: Seeing the army of supporters. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House firms up the staff for three TMs and three more prefectures go gold in the Fukuoka Region. House gets invitations to one prefecture Jaycee meeting and one district Jaycee meeting in Chu Goku Chi Ho. House sends out invitations for the global film to be shown later this month. The guild happens again and more new decor for the TMs is created.

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Colleagues attending Panchayat visit event are excited by meeting Toronto Guardians Ann and David Patterson, and seeing global film and slides of Murrin Bridge shown by local Guardian Dr. John Murchland. Seven more Community Meetings are done in midst of which House discovers host committee chairman from CM held in Pt. Pirie three years ago holding great forums in his district.

Internal: *Way of All the Earth* study is a highlight of Panchayat visit, affirming what House is about.

Contradiction: Configuring troops to sustain them in the area mission with three more state campaigns still to go. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

Macon County authorization maneuver sets appointment with state senator Ed Barker. Junior Leadership Atlanta CYF is held with 50 high school juniors in attendance from all the high schools in town. Program is sponsored by Georgia State University, Atlanta Chamber of Commerce and several other key agencies; participants call it the capstone of the year.

Internal: House celebrates three birthdays (everyone is now over the hill, 30) including Tim Lush's during the area prior trek in the region.

Contradiction: Creating imaginal form for the latter part of the quarter with only lots of things to do. (Wk. 10)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: The road to the June 16th celebration is paved with staff and community leading workshops for North Carolina Association of Volunteer Administrators, staff and CETA workers leading the Tyler V.F.W. Town Meeting, and construction underway in the restaurant, park pavillion and depot.

Internal: Guardian Bob Dexter adds a boost to construction with ongoing short visits.

Contradiction: Keeping underbrush cleared to focus on the major issues and leadership development. (Wk. 10)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: House holds fifth neighborhood TM in black central city Callahan neighborhood where "neighbors know neighbors." Police officer with neighborhood watch program arranges to draw document symbol. Maneuver teams have five more TM dates set for a total of 11 TMs set in first half of

maneuver. Colleagues from Jamestown TM (1978) accompany team regularly to set up TMs. Their witness is, "Come and see what we have done in Jamestown."

Internal: House sends out Joyce Reese to Shelley's high school graduation in Oklahoma City and Amy Jennings to brother's graduation from college in Ohio.

Contradiction: Ensuring broad grassroots participation in TM communities in order to create network of TWC. (Wk. 10)

## CHICAGO

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Two copies of *Lorimor, Gem of the Heartland* videotape are produced. ICA Board member, Charles Livermore, sets up lunch at Training Inc. for Sam Bernstein from the Mayor's Office of Manpower, Training and Employment who is interested in what the ICA can do for Chicago. The HUD final report is submitted.

Internal: Nexus welcomes Bernard Knutsen as intern at House Church.

Contradiction: Daring to experiment on ourselves in preparation for the summer without slowing momentum. (Wk. 8)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Fifth City Citizens Property Management Board holds a planning retreat to build management plan for HUD and the future. Mr. Bernstein visits Loop Training, Inc. and opens door for ICA to provide training through Mayor's Office of Education and Training. In Springfield a film preview is set up with Methodist Bishop as head of committee.

Internal: Twenty guests from East St. Louis and Wisconsin aid self-support and clean Trumbull.

Contradiction: Caring for assigned geography while being called out to consult with greater social networks. (Wk. 9)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Four metros decide to pick up task of sending letters to strongholds, a workday at Lorimor, plus schedules for global film showing.

Internal: House experiences a depth collegium on the summer program.

Contradiction: Developing metro autonomy and corporateness with the Religious House. (Wk. 8)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Six events, including Town Meetings, social methods presentations, LENS seminar and others are held. A LENS seminar is submitted to Minnesota Department of Administration which leaves only one or two state departments which have not yet had a forum or seminar conducted by the ICA.

Internal: The first LENS pedagogy to be held outside of Nexus since the new wave of LENS seminars began is held with 15 attentive participants.

Internal: House symbolizes the Merry Month of May with House Church in Mill Shoals on Sunday morning.

Contradiction: Scheduling activities to build momentum for urban impact events. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Merry Month of May reaches climax with first annual Mill Shoals Memorial weekend celebration. Everyone in the community is involved with preschool, gradeschool, town hall, first department sign up, victory booth, parade, local booths, games, tournament and county western dance on Saturday, and entertainment and union church service on Sunday.

Internal: Merry Month of May troops exert catalytic power on House and community by enabling celebration scope and eventfulness.

Contradiction: Creating new maneuvers to counteract the post celebration slump and flood of demands. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: A total of 115 people representing 50 towns are recruited for the Local Communities on the Move conference. Main Street workday paints old barn front iron-ore red.

Internal: House parties all Saturday evening in two locations—half in Lorimor, Iowa, and half at Bimbo's Bar.

Contradiction: Moving the indifferent local 80% into excitement over dialogue with 50 visiting towns. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Shirley St. John spends three days in Fifth City working on a public relations strategy for the State of Illinois for the Merry Month of May. The House begins calling campaign to entice colleagues and friends to spend weekends in Lorimor.

Internal: Inking hits a new high after old sources attend the global film and receive invitation to join in Lorimor during the month of May.

Contradiction: Fascinating TWC with all the possibilities of this moment while planning the fall maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: House sends out Janis Johnston, Paula Craddock, Jack and Wiley Womack to Peru Consult and welcomes back two metro colleagues from Academy. First two yesses for GRA are secured. Brochures are printed for seventh and last GWF of the year, the second one in Bloomington, and a core of women wake up to new possibility for their geography and for their individual engagement.

Internal: House welcomes Lydia Chen, Taiwanese Academy grad, for sojourn in Indianapolis House and enjoys some of the Indianapolis 500 festivities.

Contradiction: Discerning newest advantage through the screens of program and geography to create fresh images for the next year's victory. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Development effort nets \$6,350 in-hand, \$2,200 in the mail and \$2,000 committed.

Internal: Summer sojourner, Dee Hermes, arrives after working for ten days in Mill Shoals Project.

Contradiction: Orchestrating all program commitments so that the House gets relocated in the process. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: House kicks off the quarter with a CYF in Madison

Heights involving 150 students from three high schools and a key Town Meeting in the Bay City stronghold attended by economic, political and cultural authorization.

Internal: House holds first rotating Saturday morning ecclesiola at Guardian's home to enable region to prepare for Global Research Assembly.

Contradiction: Operating out of convenience rather than missional need. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: West Central Town Meeting plenary report requests HDP site in Central area—"the poorest of the poor" in Cleveland.

Internal: House sends out Bushman family to South Carolina to store belongings, see extended family and do Development kick-off in local church.

Contradiction: Synchronizing everyone's focus on the upcoming events. (Wk. 9)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: "Evenings with the Institute" bring together old and new colleagues in New Brunswick, New Jersey and lower Manhattan, providing dynamic stories for ICA advocates to tell.

Internal: House Church, with all House troops assigned out, is celebrated by Park Si Won from Kuh Du E Ri with Dominic and Julia Da Costa in attendance from Bombay, Ray Spencer from the Nexus and regional troops filling out the table.

Contradiction: Creating motivating Development/GRA story that expects great things of colleagues. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: In the midst of continental Town Meeting recruitment and Development, seven excellent authorization letters are obtained from key organizers and community people from past Town Meetings dating from TM '76 to present. State-wide funding and authorization are given magnificent boost.

Internal: Guardian colleague spends one week vacation working on TM Development.

Contradiction: Moving as one body to enable all TMs and positioning to come off. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Colleagues' participation in worldwide PSU as part of regular metro meetings generates enthusiasm. New stronghold is opened as Pendleton in Niagra County schedules TM.

Internal: House focuses on catching up on finance reports, and participates in track meets, rehearses for high school play and does inkind blitz.

Contradiction: Building models to focus efforts of last half of quarter. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

Contradiction: Continuing with momentum and preparing all programs for self-sufficiency as troops diminish one by one. (Wk. 9)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Formation of community advisory board for administration of AID grant gives House first concrete sign of community assuming responsibility for replacing auxiliary roles. Culverts arrive for preparation of village entrance. Greenhouse first crop of zucchini has potential buyer. Preschool trip to airport opens eyes to world of teachers and children alike.

Internal: Lettuce harvest of auxiliary member's family allows corporate teams to emerge in task.

Contradiction: Continuing Development effort in other areas rather than depending on AID. (Wk. 10)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Line installers for the electric company speak at district community meeting in Bananeiras where fazenda owners and small home owners discuss financing and use. Teacher training meeting creates the model for adult education classes. Rogerio from EMATER, federal agricultural agency, spends the day doing banana survey with the auxiliary. The prefect (mayor) of the municipality gives his approval for the Bananeiras preschool lunch program. Cooking class starts with a new village teacher. Another village woman decides to teach sewing for the village. Two auxiliary are sent to San Jose do Rio Preto to lead set-up meetings in preparation for the Town Meeting there June 10th.

Internal: Don Richards returns from Rio de Janeiro ITI bringing Huang Hsing Peng who pushes auxiliary to think globally and fast to enable local men everywhere.

Contradiction: Completing AID and BID proposals in time to secure promised grants. (Wk. 10)

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, inkind push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Global Development Centrum reports the American Lutheran Church national board visits Inyan Wakagapi, approves \$5,000 for Minto and states openness to further proposals. Hong Kong reports six tons of steel are inkinded for new community center in Hai Ou and NT\$400,000 is received in Taipei. Chicago raises \$222,000 in one week, of which \$172,000 is in-hand. Imperial Oil of Canada commits \$10,000 for third year for third Project. K. T. Li, cabinet minister, raises NT\$250,000 from two corporations for Hai Ou. Town Meeting site visits continue with The Molson Company visiting Sudbury, Ontario. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating the story that is big enough to move Development into a new orbit.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a stunning week of eventfulness as the band gathers in Chicago. Reports of 232 completion, the Sudtonggan schools, Academy evaluation, the "World's Greatest Dinner Theater" presented by Phase I and the ITIs leave centrum stunned with 2,399 people trained around the globe. The band meeting produces four talking papers illustrating resolve on behalf of the globe to move significantly this summer in practicality, massivity and profundity. The key contradiction lies in the arena of mobilizing the Movement to the radical possibility of this summer with enough practical images to get all to come, openness required to honor all the wisdom, and experience available to build a vision.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports four Village Meetings are held around Serusup with outstanding participation from local headmen. Brussels Nexus is represented at Benelux polis coverage, U.K. polis coverage and HDP acceleration. Luncheon at Chicago Nexus for wives of Swiss and German Consul Generals results in film event set for International Women's Club and women of consulate corps, and GWF set for September. GSD post updates Chicago's tracking board and discovers solid economic victories in two-thirds of the HDPs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of raising corporately the deepest questions about the one thrust that will launch us into the future.

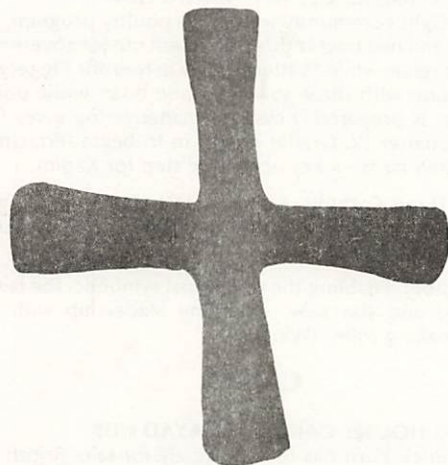
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Jeff and Ann Barry spend weekend to discuss spending six months in a Project as part of Rank Xerox employee program.

Internal: House celebrates the presence and sending out of the "three strange angels" (the youth cluster) with the consensus that the cluster experiment continue.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of momentum created by polis coverage while pushing through in all arenas. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Town Meetings touch all ages again this week. Final three polises are set up for the first week in June. Colleagues volunteer to lead TMs and use their own cars to get there.

Internal: Interchange of House troops allows for acceleration as TM crew goes south and Development comes north to complete the area miracles.

Two professional primary health care workers visit Ijede to recruit two for training. Mud pit for borehole drilling is plastered with concrete. External: House hosts 1978 ICA Belgian Board Meeting and General Assembly in which the first national financial statement is presented.

Internal: Five collegiums on Saturday morning cover various topics of concern to the whole Nexus, are followed by a great celebration which includes "The Deer Hunter" and conversation.

Contradiction: Demonstrating the task of the Summer amidst the wrap-up required on all fronts. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Twelve TMs including one for women and local workshop leaders move stronghold through Phase II. Squad meetings link two strongholds into one effort.

External: Arthur Anderson Co. makes the largest corporation contribution for Town Meeting in Europe. Munchen Monopoly continues via Regensburg Railroad and Augsburg Avenue with completion of 216 polises a real possibility by the weekend.

Internal: On American holiday, Sands, masquerading as "an American volunteer for the ICA," sets up eight more Development appointments. Collegium on the new European grid continues the struggle to give form to new realities.

Contradiction: Building on the new advantages quickly enough to recruit the GRA and solidify decisions to carry through the Summer, now that polis coverage campaign is complete. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Issue No. 20 of *Laterne* newspaper hits the streets just in time or flea market push. Stake IV distribution is done in record time on a holiday. Flea market gives great chance to tell Project story to press contacts.

Internal: Shortage of troops is gift as three-year old poses for Berlin newspaper flea market publicity, complete with Kreuzberg Ost T-shirt.

Contradiction: Globalizing people trained to do nitty gritty in order to renew their spirit for long march. (Wk. 11)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Eight community women in poultry program, four midwives, and two tractor drivers are sent out for government training program while 15 attend HDTS in Nairobi. Piggery is in full operation with three sows and one boar, while poultry foundation is prepared. Keystone maneuvering gives fresh focus to Quarter IV. Grader moves in to begin terracing 20 acre irrigated farm—a key economic step for Kapini.

Internal: Three Catholic Aspirants in training are assigned eight months to the KHDP by Archbishop Milingo during Good Friday visit to Project.

Contradiction: Enabling the traditional symbolic, the landed established and the new, emerging leadership with new decision making roles. (Wk. 10)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Brick burn has full kiln ready for sale. British firm doing survey of water systems in Egypt calls Bayad "the best demonstration of local initiative and maintenance." Visit of Board member Aziza Hussein is signal event. Regular meetings of economic and social commissions are held.

Internal: Gift of Mitsubishi pick-up from Electessadia Co. gives House wheels for the first time. Self-support victory is won as one job covers food and stipends for 21.

Contradiction: Finding creative ways to keep the momentum going as the temperature rises and offices vacate (Wk. 11)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Marketing guild of HDTI breaks open door to supplying every government office with banana fibre products from COMARTKA. Ford Foundation sends evaluation screen for proposal to Ford. During celebration of Kawangware and Kamweleni keystones, Great Hall resounds with laughter as skits illustrate clarity on learnings from the School. Urban excursion is a fantastic happening as School experiences computers and telecommunications systems that brings world to their doorstep. All who participated are ready to see that every villager has the possibility of the 20th century becoming their own. Over 100 from Kawangware guilds participate in lunch hour management systems meetings as they enable the creation of the systems that will move the community miles down the road.

Internal: New confidence and excitement shows up in School participants as the building of plans and models continues well after guild hours and in the disciplined style of up-front leadership.

Contradiction: Building significant models for the future to keep the spirit alive and the engagement total for all the troops following the School. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Seventy percent of the community engages in completion of the pipe-line trench. The first three ferrocement water jars (500 and 1,000 gallons) are completed in Stake 5.

Internal: Evening prayers are now taking deeper root in the House.

Contradiction: Transporting enough materials to build four water tanks per week in Stake 5. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Site selection is accomplished for the 75 Projects, and the third draw of the first installment of the EEC grant is received, pushing a long way toward the completion of the 232.

Internal: A week of collegiums in preparation for the GRA and the CRA (Continental Research Assembly) prove to be a great advantage toward the future of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between bolstering the 232 and moving into the 2500. (Wk. 10)

Three roads are bricked in Sikror. Mr. Manmohan Singh, Rural Development Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce, sets Development appointments. Stake meeting is held. One man is sent to HDTs. Deputy Panchayat Raj Officer visits village.

Internal: Laxmi and Vinod Yadav join Sikror auxiliary.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of change to summer style and mood rather than being slowed down by it. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTs which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Forces engage in four areas: Singapore, Sydney, Suva and Hong Kong.

Internal: Mauno Wilkkinen, global cyclist, sojourner extraordinaire, departs, leaving in the wake many repairs—chairs, tables, doors, clothes line poles and a manicured lawn!

Contradiction: Dancing through visa restrictions while waiting for registration response. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Floating fish farm is in the third phase with six more units under construction. One thousand chickens have their beaks trimmed and receive injections in one week. New T-shirts for purchase with SHDP grid are distributed at parents meeting the day before trip to the airport in Kota Kinabalu. Parents are given tour through small planes and helicopters along with preschool. Friday night work allows families of handicraft workers to pitch in and help build tables for the industry. Development push for first year celebration brochure nets \$4500 in one week.

Internal: Auxiliary travels to Mount Kinabalu as way of celebrating the sending out of Jim Fleischman back to America.

Contradiction: Finding a new market for handicraft products. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: The village participates in a week of training and development. Three thousand dollars is donated for anniversary booklet and \$1300 for health training. Three sewing machines are inkinded. New preschool uniforms arrive. Girl scouts begin. Curriculum training for preschool breaks through. Health caretakers are trained in family planning. Twenty families get chicken medicine. The minister of culture and two newspaper reporters visit.

Internal: Full auxiliary participates in a workday.

Contradiction: Transferring the story of acting on behalf of the globe to the village. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Counterpart Home Affairs sets up one hour visit with national head of village development (PMD) who wants ICA to work with them also, especially in villager training. "Money is no problem. We need your help now to help us care for 62,850 village clusters in Indonesia." Also, Home Affairs invites head of E. Java provincial development (next to governor) to Jakarta to personally invite ICA to come and "just look at some villages in E. Java. We of course will cover your expenses and carry you personally to meet the villagers."

Internal: Chia goes to Bubun to teach management systems.

Contradiction: Allowing Indonesian government and private sector to authentically get their recommendations into the ICA for global consideration in July and also fully concentrate on KHDP industries. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Old stage is removed to clear village entrance way for Panchayat visit. Bubun grid is moved to complement symbolism of House. Eight Department of Education officials open sewing class. Contact is made to arrange opening of mechanic training course. Guardians' meeting at the home of lumber tycoon brings 60 to hear Duffy and Epps talk about the global task.

Internal: Laiya and Sutiya have new baby girl not yet named.

Contradiction: Catalyzing rapid village involvement in creating visible signs without financial dependence. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Agriculture module is set for Week 8, with consent of Dick Wet to attend. Kacamatan (county) is golded on Saturday night at celebration, with the last two of 18 village TMs completed. All 18 are done by villagers in the last two months.

Internal: Neil Rees arrives from Australia and builds a long overdue bridge.

Contradiction: Spinning more than one plate and going the distance. (Wk. 10)

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: New Nexus facility is secured and preparation is begun for the July move.

Internal: Staff report on the Philippine HDTS.

Contradiction: Planning the leap over the next abyss, i.e., how to make new facility first class. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Dental clinic plumbing and electricity is completed and printer donates printing of advertisements without even being asked. One of the elderly women performs a solo in nationwide singing contest for the elder. One elder and one youth complete two more visa applications to visit the Hai Ou Project.

Internal: The week's focus on summer brooding via constructs covers a host of concerns across the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Covering Project and region responsibly in the summer when many villagers and staff will be away. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: YMCA requests TM. Steel bars for House are delivered. Land is cleared and foundation ready for digging. Penny Tung (past city president) visits and fifteen are impressed by Hai Ou's development.

Internal: Bruce Macomber visits and participates in second anniversary celebration planning.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the practical next steps for expanding Hai Ou enterprises. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Major Development grants are approved for Mactan Cluster Projects. References by Cebu local people who know and work with Projects are key to 127,000 pesos in April—a record month. An electric generator is purchased for Langub. Multiple drug association contacts reveal desire to engage locally. Request for Mountain Cluster consultants for Magtuod, La Pax, Carmen and New Valencia Projects gets enthusiastic response from many companies.

Internal: *The Deer Hunter* seen in Asian situation is radical address.

Contradiction: Putting together a package of programs that launch a new era. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Over US\$10,000 is deposited in one week through ICA development effort of past seven months. Largest single gift of US\$7,000 is received from chairman of the Delta Group in Taipei.

Internal: Ecclesiola with Dunne sparks reflection on the history of the Order and Movement and the demands of moving into 1979-1980.

Contradiction: Getting prepared for the assignment and operating discontinuities of the summer. (Wk. 11)

Citibank donates four motorscooters. Industries have new burst of energy with 3,000 rocks delivered, new low in buri furniture rejects and possibility of T-shirt sewing industry. World Bank knocks on door re: HDPs on neighboring island. National Economic Development Authority requests 32 GCFs in Cebu mountains, fully funded

Internal: Mactan Cluster staff celebrate week at bumper car arena. June Vitality month planning along with Dunne Chapter Five remove post-HDTS blues.

Contradiction: Grounding post-HDTS euphoria in concrete daily maneuvering and practical '79-'80 models. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: House sends out 58 participants to the HDTS from the five villages in the Mountain Cluster. The tractor arrives and starts plowing 30 hectors, 2,500 feet of pipe is laid and the water system is turned on bringing regular water to the mountain top for the first time. Davao City sends 20 truckloads of gravel for the Langub road.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

Contradiction: Moving from training to local responsibility for ongoing programs as new projects are started and regularity established. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Funds raised for Guardian participation from Cusick and food is in-kind for auxiliary.

Internal: Metro hosts colleagues from Cusick HDP and are moved to assist on needs there.

Contradiction: Breaking loose local participation and spiritual nurture in a time of aridity. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: House mails newsletter with focus on Trash Barro selling and HDP consultant recruitment, and schedules locally-hosted slide show.

Internal: Little League becomes vehicle of parish engagement as House member becomes team mother.

Contradiction: Creating tactical actions within permeation assignments during Merry Month of May. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Tribe purchases Trashbarros for headstart schools. Store manager starts merchandizing research in Bismarck. Pipes finally thaw, releasing water for day care facility.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Plumbing in the community hall is finally plumbed to the depths resulting in running water. Whole House does two-day blitz of housing repair needs survey on all 50 village houses for the sake of getting funds for housing renovation before winter.

Internal: Memorial Day picnic at pastoral resort, and Saturday-Sunday boating outing on Minto lakes put bookends of celebration on the week.

Contradiction: Swirling tactics into eventfulness in the midst of community transiency. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Appointment with local representative of Secretary of State results in two-hour visit and helpful exchange of data while speaking engagement with New Horizons Boards opens way to future senior citizens' events, Film nights in Prince Albert and Saskatoon with Development present widens potential colleague base.

Internal: Rebecca Grow arrives straight from Academy just in time for final push on Edmonton training event and Summer '79 recruitment.

Contradiction: Meshing the pace and timing of the way society operates with the urgency of immediate impact events. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Visits to silk screen artists, Metis historians, and agents highlight a week of preparation for Vogar Products second year funding proposal. Workday completes sidewalk and grass seed at one of the four designated demonstration yards

Internal: Guardian organizes Winnipeg work crew for ICA demonstration yard for next three week IIs.

Contradiction: Channeling independent style into corporate decisions, action and structures. (Wk. 11)

## HOUSTON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Two-part Town Meeting with three shifts in one department (Powder Metal) at Hughes Tool is a revolutionary first. One-half day of Development nets \$2,400 in-hand and more on the way. Houston Caring Corps returns for weekly dinner and planning '79-'80 Houston strategy.

Internal: House hosts Rose family as David Rose graduates with highest honors and "Most Outstanding Student" award.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum going through Quarter I in preparation for Quarter II and engaging metro colleagues in actualizing plans. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: The Mayor and her staff are working on a park proposal to be submitted to Heritage Conservation and Recreational Services on June 5, 1979. Voice is published with City Council meeting notes which emphasize the City Council's decision to collect delinquent water bills (some are 20 months in arrears.) which occasions new decision on citizen's part to handle personal finances more intensionally. Three citizens show up at town hall to pay water bills the day after the Voice comes out, first thing in the morning. Internal: Most students in Asherton graduate.

Contradiction: Making plans over against uncertainty. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Following Indianhoma year-end celebration, region decides to meet for regional planning/celebration over Memorial Day weekend.

Internal: Fourth colleague in as many weeks leads Dunne study in ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Using colleagues to the fullest. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Twenty-five Guardians attend "Passing Over" Party to hear report on Kuh Du E Ri from Park Si Won and to send out Glenda Adkinson to Lima Consultation. TM is held in Denton with 40 senior citizens. House receives another car from GMC for two weeks. Xerox Corporation calls to say personnel director will attend TM.

Internal: House hosts Mr. and Mrs. Ben Avery, Park Si Won, L. E. Philbrook, Rev. Chang and Kim Won Ho; celebrates graduation of first grader; and continues facility search with visits to six city offices, the Baptists and the Methodists.

Contradiction: Planning the future in the tension between rural and urban, region and state, immediate and long-range, historical and profound. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: State Assembly recruitment strategy is designed and launched with 39 clusters of three to 10 towns targeted and cluster meetings set for next week. Calling for cluster meetings reveals already existing anticipation with some towns formally electing delegations. Eight more Town Meetings are held,

averaging 70 in attendance for the week and bringing total to 190 events. All printing is inked for the state report, a special task force gives surprise \$20,000 grant to Town Meeting: Mississippi, with national director making announcement in press conference in Jackson. The grant was set up by Barbara Sugarman of ACTION, who is the reviewer for next year's \$140,000 request. External: Town Meetings near 200 mark in Mississippi—Marietta has 40 in first outdoor, 30 per pavillion, TM. CSA gives \$20,000 grant to TM: Mississippi for second half funding saying, "This is the best citizen participation program we've seen."

Internal: House welcomes David Scott, Lynette Pennington, Nancy Vosler and Barbara Barkony to Memphis for Mississippi State report writing.

Contradiction: Ensuring a significant state assembly. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Jersey TM is held, a town of 400, and the mayor becomes so excited he pays the full \$200 for the program. GWF planning meeting with eight neighborhood representatives includes Economic Opportunity Atlanta, block club leaders and preschool directors. Macon County authorization maneuver sets appointment with statesenator Ed Barker. Junior Leadership Atlanta CYF is held with 50 high school juniors in attendance from all the high schools in town. Contradiction: Keeping underbrush cleared to focus on the major issues and leadership development. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

representatives from Southern Bell and United Telephone. Contact is established with the State Director of Volunteer Services who promises to attend Lake County Assembly.

Internal: House sends out Austin Brooks to Jamaica.

Contradiction: Building a trans-rational model which will hold all tasks, time and troops for the month of June to prevent paralysis. (Wk. 11)

## **CHICAGO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Nexus hosts continental PSU on Summer Mobilization as GRA preparation gets underway with expanded Research body. Development follows week of raising \$222,000 with a week of raising \$170,000 in "Even Really Even" Campaign to be "in the black" by July 15. Day I troops form a human chain and unload 10,000 Annual Reports.

Internal: *Ambience and interchange* conclude evenings of work on the Summer and intimate things to come.

Contradiction: "Turning the ship around" from Nexus "business as usual" to "full steam ahead" preparing for the Summer. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Fifth City Citizens Property Management Board holds a planning retreat to build management plan for HUD and the future. Mr. Bernstein visits Loop Training, Inc. and opens door for ICA to provide training through Mayor's Office of Education and Training. External: Memorial Day parade and service at cemetery draws 75 people from five county region.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic continues as Mathias arrive during House workday.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

Contradiction: Fascinating TWC with all the possibilities of this moment while planning the fall maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

Internal: Rosi Meyberg visits Cano Negro again on her way back to Brazil.

Contradiction: Continuing with momentum and preparing all programs for self-sufficiency as troops diminish one by one. (Wk. 9)

**BUENOS AIRES**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Sewing industry makes eight aprons and sells them to local store along with house dress and opens up orders for more. New sub-contract obtained for U.S. Marines uniform stripes and patches. Community land issue is discussed with decision about location of new bakery, community center and chapel.

Internal: Collegium table expands and decreases as House welcomes Ann and Ralph Castro and Bill and Nan Grow on their way to Peru. International exchange, Jose Luis from Bananeiras, arrives. Trudi Mueller, Becky Appenfelder, Helen Worden and Kathy Tomlinson are sent out from community to enable San Vicente de Azpita Consult on way to Chicago.

Contradiction: Reorganizing the troops following unanticipated transitions. (Wk. 11)

**RIO DE JANEIRO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Line installers for the electric company speak at district community meeting in Bananeiras where fazenda owners and small home owners discuss financing and use. Teacher training meeting creates the model for adult education classes. Rogerio from EMATER, federal agricultural agency, spends the day doing banana survey with the auxiliary. The prefect (mayor) of the municipality gives his approval for the Bananeiras preschool lunch program. Cooking class starts with a new village teacher. Another village woman decides to teach sewing for the village. Two auxiliary are sent to San Jose do Rio Pieto to lead set-up meetings in preparation for the Town Meeting there June 10th.

Internal: Auxiliary and community sends out Jose Luiz Guimaraes to assignment in Sol de Septiembre HDP in Chile with a farewell supper and presentation of gifts.

Contradiction: Getting leadership training and adult education off the ground in one single leap. (Wk. 10)

**HAVANA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: One hundred fifty community members participate in Labor Day project which focuses on the new preschool. A delicious lunch is served, climaxing the day with a dance.

Internal: House and community celebrate the 73rd birthday party of the oldest member of the builders guild with Jamaican singing and dancing.

Contradiction: Getting the preschool completed for the anniversary celebration. (Wk. 11)

**MEXICO CITY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Week of fantastic Development, including one check for \$500 and the promise of \$800 more, ends when a feature story in a large newspaper concerning community team's search for printing results in the donation of a new mimeograph machine.

Internal: Don Richards returns from Rio de Janeiro ITI bringing Huang Hsing Peng who pushes auxiliary to think globally and fast to enable local men everywhere.

Contradiction: Completing AID and BID proposals in time to secure promised grants. (Wk. 10)

**LIMA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITA HDP**

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, inkind push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Internal: Access to nearby telephone simplifies Development calling and Saturday barhopping celebration with cadre colleague provides encounter with Peruvian folk music.

Contradiction: Dealing with inadequate practical arrangements in the face of ever-mounting missional demands. (Wk. 6)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the Australian Development Assistance Bureau approves grant of \$10,000 for Salani HDP. Brussels reports second installment of EEC grant for Maharashtra in hand and first large company funding for TM comes through. In Rome ICA participates with A. Vanistendal in a meeting with 55 Religious Order Superiors. Augustinian Friars give \$700 and Franciscans \$1,094. "Even Really Even" Campaign gets underway in Chicago with a 222 week (not month) followed by a 170 week. ARCA Foundation, New York, says yes to \$15,000, a sure opener of other large foundation doors. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the tension between preparation for the GRA and Council and continuing Centrum work.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a stunning week of eventfulness as the band gathers in Chicago. Reports of 232 completion, the Sudtonggan schools, Academy evaluation, the "World's Greatest Dinner Theater" presented by Phase I and the ITIs leave centrum stunned with 2,399 people trained around the globe. The band meeting produces four talking papers illustrating resolve on behalf of the globe to move significantly this summer in practicality, massivity and profundity. The key contradiction lies in the arena of mobilizing the Movement to the radical possibility of this summer with enough practical images to get all to come, openness required to honor all the wisdom, and experience available to build a vision.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports four Village Meetings are held around Serusup with outstanding participation from local headmen. Brussels Nexus is represented at Benelux polis coverage, U.K. polis coverage and HDP acceleration. Luncheon at Chicago Nexus for wives of Swiss and German Consul Generals results in film event set for International Women's Club and women of consulate corps, and GWF set for September. GSD post updates Chicago's tracking board and discovers solid economic victories in two-thirds of the HDPs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of raising corporately the deepest questions about the one thrust that will launch us into the future.

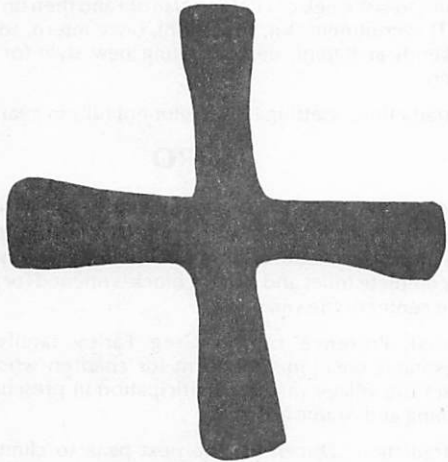
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Success of campaign begins to be felt as one clergyman calls to request three Town Meetings in one day. In kind trip to American Embassy and local colleges nets six filing cabinets, tables and 364 pieces of china (mostly soup bowls).

Internal: House sends out Sr. Joyce Blackwell after two-week sojourn and welcomes Robert Rank and Margarita Farid for Development blitz.

Contradiction: Articulating the victory of the quarter in order to release the concrete vision for the next two months and name the death ground. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Colleagues come to the rescue as train breaks down and leaves orchestrator 100 miles from Fallin Town Meeting.

Internal: In kind file cabinets allow for expansion of Metro files.

Contradiction: Putting polis data in order so that anyone can do the next phase effectively at a minute's notice. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TA'IRGWAITH HDP

External: The Miracle Month of May begins with village entrance miracle—a new welcome sign, village directory, white stone road edging and repairs plus a beautiful new mural. Stake calls determine future miracles and line up muscle power.

Internal: House watches on TV the drama of the election of first woman head of government in the West.

Contradiction: Building momentum around Management Board to enable articulation of their victories. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: 29 TMs and one CYF are held this past week. First mock-up of TM: UK brochure is finished and tabulation of what it took in terms of setting up 106 TMs is completed. Area meets to evaluate the past year.

*The land now desolate shall be tilled instead of lying waste for every passer-by to see. External: Report on 80 Forums in French is completed for printing. Newsletter goes to translator, Sr. Yvonne, and old colleague gives first gift ever for Ijede.

Internal: New construct and time design transform and focus collegiums.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of global programs to train local leadership. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The province of L'Aquila is paving the road to the farm valley of Cascina. A new set of cement stairs from the top road of the village is completed. The first chair is assembled. Seven Italians work in the industry.

Internal: House sees the First Great Train Robbery for ecclesiola. House Church Feast in Rome celebrates Woodbury's long marriage covenant.

Contradiction: Finding a house to live in the village after May 31. (Wk. 10)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Three major companies accept contracts with sewing industry for orders, breaking through the contracts contradiction. Two professional primary health care workers visit Ijede to recruit two for training. Mud pit for borehole drilling is plastered with concrete. Ijede Community Industries Articles and memorandum are combed by three auxiliary, a lawyer and a management consultant.

Internal: Announcement of the visit of the duty officer of the Secretary to the Lagos state government during the past week augments awe of study at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Changing the "if you produce, we'll produce" mentality into "Let's move." (Wk. 10)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus rides to a whirlwind finish with the Diamond Hexagon Campaign for Town Meeting in France.

Internal: Week II conversations on the mythology of the 20th Century zero in on the relevancy of the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Using the advantage of the corporate to enable the task effectively. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House celebrates week of wonder for the Benelux Waltz: eight TMs orchestrated, four set by phone in Amsterdam, and phone call from colleague for workshop leader training and stronghold setup.

Internal: Area remaneuvering and celebration get House all in one place for Week II.

Contradiction: Making the shift from polis brigade to stronghold circus masters. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Four Dorpsdags are set up in one day in foray to kick off Dutch Done Maneuver. Pledge comes in to bring House close to \$1,000 in-hand for month.

Internal: Continental Maneuver troops sweep in with miracles in their path and whisk House away to Brussels for remaneuver session.

Contradiction: Breaking loose new level of colleague participation in GCF campaign. (Wk. 6)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Three vehicles head north for the Hannover Hustle (Phase I on the Great German Gamble) after a four-day respite of maneuver building highlighted by readings from *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*. When women's group of a local church declines the opportunity, pastor takes team into psychiatric hospital for first *Gemeindeforum* within that heretofore un-dreamed-of network.

Internal: New decor embracing the Hannover Hustle, the Munich Monopoly, and the Stuttgart Shuffle brightens the office with pool tables, deed cards and four aces.

Contradiction: Creating the offers that cannot be refused which will allow volunteers to step forward to man the Volkswagens and control center. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Cafe Laterne is repainted and decored by community on their own initiative. Full six-week English course begins with two exciting lessons of two hours each.

Internal: Maria Maguire returns from India with a long, insightful report and Barbara Allerdig returns from Rome talk to 100 Religious Superiors.

Contradiction: Empowering the community task forces as leadership nurture structures. (Wk. 6)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Large group of Zambian Chiefs visit KHDP and are overwhelmed. On seeing three-year-old Shinondo, leading

160 preschoolers in songs and rituals; money is immediately pulled out of pockets for the school. The Chiefs judge the five stake shelters built by residents and award "The Most Outstanding Stake" award, an engraved copper bowl, to Stake Three. Inspired by Kapini's Health Care system, a new course in primary health care for villagers is designed by the Ministry and village caretakers attend first session. Applications from Kapini families to farm the 20-acre irrigated farm come in.

Internal: House sends out Walter Nkana and Eusebio Muloshi, interns, to last week of HDTs in Nairobi and then on to Malawi for ITI recruitment. Vic Manchishi, once intern, sojourns on weekends at Kapini, demonstrating new style for Extended Order.

Contradiction: Getting ITI recruitment fully in gear. (Wk. 12)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water gushing forth from *hanafeyas* (public water taps) in all six stakes drowns images of impossibility while the first complete toilet and shower block is opened for public use in the center of the village.

Internal: Presence of the Greg Farley family of four necessitates creation of a dorm for children who begin to impact the village through participation in preschool lesson planning and Arabic lessons.

Contradiction: Discerning the next peak to climb that will beckon village motivation now that water is accessible to every home. (Wk. 5)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Landowners dinner with staff representatives of several nations breaks through as it establishes foundation for land lease maneuver. Industry systems are ready to present to guilds for consensus. Over 50% of COMARTKA's basket orders are ready. Low-cost roofing panel holds great possibilities for future. *Kawangware Voice* is distributed. Pig unit site is leveled and ready for building to continue. Pigs are key to economic expansion of farming industries.

Internal: Three days of family course impacts participants and staff alike as lectures, timelines, budgets and conversations speak to depth issues. Witness by one auxiliary articulates that new images give new possibilities for missional families on the African continent.

Contradiction: Creating strategies to move around, under, over and through the land issue when so much depends on land. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Pump and pipes are delivered. Standard four classroom walls start going up. Stake leaders play role of auxiliary as forty work on pathways in spite of heavy rain.

Internal: Three day fast culminating in night watch intensifies missional demand.

Contradiction: Mobilizing community effectively with limited staff. (Wk. 12)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: Site selection is accomplished for the 75 Projects, and the third draw of the first installment of the EEC grant is received, pushing a long way toward the completion of the 232.

Internal: A week of collegiums in preparation for the GRA and the CRA (Continental Research Assembly) prove to be a great advantage toward the future of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between bolstering the 232 and moving into the 2500. (Wk. 10)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Evening with the Institute, including global film showing, hosts representatives from World Bank, AID, Rotary Club and Madangeer Community Development Group. Three roads are bricked in Sikror. Mr. Manmohan Singh, Rural Development Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce, sets Development appointments. Stake meeting is held. One manissent to HDTs. Deputy Panchayat Raj Officer visits village.

Internal: Laxmi and Vinod Yadav join Sikror auxiliary.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of change to summer style and mood rather than being slowed down by it. (Wk. 9)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for harigans. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTs which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: All centurms are represented in planning meeting.

Internal: Dinner with Guardian couple highlights year's end.

Contradiction: Appropriating the care provided by the structures of society. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Visit with Datu Hamid, Minister of Youth, Culture and Sports, assures new market for handicraft handbags and requests for working paper on methods to promote handicrafts, culture and language for 22 districts who each have \$50,000 to spend and no methods of implementation. New floating fish farm construction begins while units for more fish are constructed. Health caretakers have two days training at TB hospital and then visit every house in the village the next day. Toyota asks for proposal for vehicle to be given to Serusup.

Internal: Troika planning meeting celebrates new compact auxiliary — five persons.

Contradiction: Getting money available through district office released in time to get everything done in next 12 days for first year anniversary celebration. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAILUI HDP**

External: Electricity connected to the Pasar (market) provides cold soft drinks which are in growing demand. Preschool visits the Kuala Lumpur Zoo. Second Mini-Moke (a car) is inkinded. American staff and Harper children join in with 1,000 Americans for Memorial Day picnic. Son of the Canadian High Commissioner; Director of Dusan Tua, skills training camp five miles from project; and Barbara Anderson, TV actress of Ironsides fame, enjoy visit, including tea at Hasnah's house and lesson in putting on a sarong.

Internal: Canadian, Don Rutherford, on Asian tour hears about Project in Singapore and, knowing nothing about ICA, decides to come and stay at Project for several weeks.

Contradiction: Biting at the future while taking one step at a time forward and then absorbing it. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Secretariat responds favorably to total Development report: \$180,000 developed specifically for KHDP programs and \$240,000 actually put in, including inkind. Village consensus to transfer responsibility for village salaries to Secretariat, effective Week 12. House recruits Guardians from Jakarta and Medan for GRA and writes proposal for one year provincial agreement for KHDP.

Internal: Experimental transposition of RS-1 sessions receives depth response. "Who says life is good?"

Contradiction: Building an appropriate local economic unit with government and village that will ensure peak motivity and effectivity. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: Major emphasis is on agriculture as Bupati's (district officer) wife arrives with 30 others to encourage family vegetable gardens, demonstrate cooking nutritious food and present new games to preschool. Hoeing begins on one hectare demonstration garden. Two hectares are prepared for new coconut plantings. Preschool celebrates end of year as 53 come for mungbean snack and to say farewell to seven year olds. Staff participates in briefing for all USAID funded Projects in Sumatra.

Internal: House experiences constannt stream in and out of Bubun.

Contradiction: Directing the passion and energy of the community into effective corporate structures. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Agriculture module is set for Week 8, with consent of Dick West to attend. Preparation continues with

farmer's meetings, inking of handbooks on planting crops and consultation with agricultural services. Kacamatan (county) is golded on Saturday night at celebration, with the last two of 18 village TMs completed. All 18 are done by villagers in the last two months.

Internal: Neil Rees arrives from Australia and builds a long overdue bridge.

Contradiction: Spinning more than one plate and going the distance. (Wk. 12)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: LENS takes on new momentum across the zone with treks firming up for Quarter II. Development call news promise of US\$5000 from Dow Chemical for this year, plus request for proposal for next year. Contractor is hired to remodel interior of new facility.

Internal: Nexus hosts congregational dinner for upcoming wedding of Frank Soderlind and Mary Kaye Heisler with 25 seated around the table including seven guests from Hong Kong International School.

Contradiction: Moving forward on tasks while pulling things together for Quarter I preparation. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: The new dental clinic treats first patients. The Nam Wai Foundation Board meets and decides how to hold elections in whole village and begins enfranchisement of all villagers over 21 years, after meeting with local government. LENS calls on businesses reveals great interest and two confirmed requests.

Internal: Congregation dinner for Frank Soderlind and Mary Kaye Heisler's forthcoming wedding is held in celebrative style at Nexus with great team work from all.

Contradiction: Journeying villagers and colleagues from responsibility for particulars to responsibility for the whole. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: YMCA requests TM. Steel bars for House are delivered. Land is cleared and foundation ready for digging. Penny Tung (past city president) visits and fifteen are impressed by Hai Ou's development.

Internal: Bruce Macomber visits and participates in second anniversary celebration planning.

Contradiction: Getting clear on the practical next steps for expanding Hai Ou enterprises. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Major Development grants are approved for Mactan Cluster Projects. References by Cebu local people who know and work with Projects are key to 127,000 pesos in April—a record month. An electric generator is purchased for Langub. Multiple drug association contacts reveal desire to engage locally. Request for Mountain Cluster consultants for Magtuod, La Pax, Carmen and New Valencia Projects gets enthusiastic response from many companies.

Internal: *The Deer Hunter* seen in Asian situation is radical address.

Contradiction: Putting together a package of programs that launch a new era. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Metro colleagues celebrate end of the quarter with viewing of the film *Cool Hand Luke*. Invitations to Hai Ou second anniversary celebration are prepared and sent to the printer. General manager of 20th Century Fox Distributors in Taipei recommends ICA to a company which can edit Chinese script titles onto the global film.

Internal: Chinese Dragon Boat Festival and holiday provides a great opportunity to celebrate John Slicker's 24th birthday and Oden family's send out to United States for summer Ph.D. accreditation studies.

Contradiction: Shifting into Quarter I structures while eliciting participation of key corporation supporters in second anniversary celebration of Hai Ou Project. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: HDTs sends out 100 new "Blue Shirts" to begin Mountain Cluster, while Mactan Cluster holds first in a series of Beautiful House contests, with 25 stake winners in five villages receiving paint in preparation for "Most Beautiful House" in Cluster contest. Citibank donates four motorscooters. Industries have new burst of energy with 3,000 rocks delivered, new low in buri furniture rejects and possibility of T-shirt sewing industry. World Bank knocks on door re: HDPs on neighboring island. National Economic Development Authority requests 32 GCFs in Cebu mountains, fully funded

Contradiction: Being in the world, as well as not of the world in a Religious House. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Town Mc Cabe, Powell, Loudermilk and Ruth Marshall have great visit with Lewis Donelson, Tennessee Governor's top man, who will send a representative to the Mississippi State Assembly and talk with the Governor of Tennessee about TM: Tennessee. Internal: House attends Headstart, kindergarten, sixth grade, eighth grade and high school graduations and hosts Carla Henschen at a tea in honor of her graduation fro high school Ninth graders return with power from global Project assignments.

Contradiction: Turning really turning the ship around toward Summer '79. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Fifth City Citizens Property Management Board holds a planning retreat to build management plan for HUD and the future. Mr. Bernstein visits Loop Training, Inc. and opens door for ICA to provide training through Mayor's Office of Education and Training. In Springfield a film preview is set up with Methodist Bishop as head of committee.

Internal: Twenty guests from East St. Louis and Wisconsin aid self-support and clean Trumbull.

Contradiction: Caring for assigned geography while being called out to consult with greater social networks. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: Expecting to be left in vacuum of Memorial Day celebration completion, but wake-up in 3-ring circus! Stronghold established with ECF scheduled. 12 CETA employees launch summer Youth Program. Village representatives visit Springfield to talk with Lt. Governor and EPA regarding sewer.

Internal: Summer youth program uses House for orientation collegium.

Contradiction: Formalizing and planning the implementation of Quarter I's plan. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: Seventy-five people from 31 communities converge on Kinney for the first annual Local Communities on the Move Conference. Two hundred celebrate at the pig roast and dance that night. Sunday morning's reflection by excited new colleagues occasions mayor of Gilbert, Minnesota, (Kinney's Iron Range neighbor) to challenge "Hold the annual conference in Gilbert next year, and we'll show you a town on the move!" #### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Development team drops in for a week. Last GWF of this program year held in Bloomington, Indiana provides substantial new contacts with Church Women United, Women's Political Caucus and Cooperative Extension and debut for two new faculty who do excellent job. Janis Johnston and Jack Womack return from Peru with reports and filled with the excitement of Latin America.

Internal: Sojourner Lydia Chen returns to Chicago Nexus for summer decor work.

Contradiction: Finding the last \$1,093 to clinch this year's self-support victory. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Two intense Town Meetings held, two Youth Forums set for Quarter II and one stronghold core meeting scheduled for next week challenge Quarter I drop-out syndrome and reveal social urgency of awakening events.

Contradiction: Securing long sought after House facility. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: House kicks off the quarter with a CYF in Madison Heights involving 150 students from three high schools and a key Town Meeting in the Bay City stronghold attended by economic, political and cultural authorization.

Internal: House experiences a week of effulgence and celebration as Lorne auxiliary move in and complete first draft of funding package for wood industry, temporary jobs

keep getting lined up and the Daily Office room is put back into use after fire.

Contradiction: Focusing and timing the one week maneuver that will ensure decisive victory for GWF, film event and GRA. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Three Evenings at Institute are set for the end of the quarter. Summer mobilization taskforce is initiated and area "Hawk" is sent to Chicago.

orders for more. New sub-contract obtained for U.S. Marines uniform stripes and patches. Community land issue is discussed with decision about location of new bakery, community center and chapel.

Internal: Collegium table expands and decreases as House welcomes Ann and Ralph Castro and Bill and Nan Grow on their way to Peru. International exchange, Jose Luis from Bananeiras, arrives. Trudi Mueller, Becky Appenfelder, Helen Worden and Kathy Tomlinson are sent out from community to enable San Vicente de Azpita Consult on way to Chicago.

Contradiction: Reorganizing the troops following unanticipated transitions. (Wk. 11)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: In the midst of training courses and usual activities going on the auxiliary and community turn with anticipation to planning the Project's first year celebration.

Internal: Auxiliary consolidates housing and celebrates Jim Campbell's birthday.

Contradiction: Accelerating leadership take over and ensuring events come off with necessary finesse. (Wk. 12)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: One hundred fifty community members participate in Labor Day project which focuses on the new preschool. A delicious lunch is served, climaxing the day with a dance.

Internal: House and community celebrate the 73rd birthday party of the oldest member of the builders guild with Jamaican singing and dancing.

Contradiction: Getting the preschool completed for the anniversary celebration. (Wk. 11)

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Week of fantastic Development, including one check for \$500 and the promise of \$800 more, ends when a feature story in a large newspaper concerning community team's search for printing results in the donation of a new mimeograph machine.

Internal: Don Richards returns from Rio de Janeiro ITI bringing Huang Hsing Peng who pushes auxiliary to think globally and fast to enable local men everywhere.

Contradiction: Completing AID and BID proposals in time to secure promised grants. (Wk. 10)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITA HDP**

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, ink push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Global Development Centrum reports a week of fives with a request for proposal from Dow Chemical (Hong Kong) for \$5000 a \$5,000 surprise from a Canadian patron and a US AID draw of \$15,000, a portion of which goes to Kelapa Dua Community Center. Pfizer puts together a four-page global report with photos on their participation in six HDPs but focusing on Nam Wai. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining momentum to cover all fronts during Quarter I, 1979-1980.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports a time of drawing together a most fruitful year. The Band Meeting in Chicago creates talking papers on the future. Evaluation and manual writing on Sudtonggan's second HDTS and other training constructs gives us a new future in training. Research Centrum gathers in Chicago to refocus future. As the focus of the summer on global service and the way becomes clearer we are seeing the profound importance of modules, methods, retreats and all the many things we've done towards a singular new future. The key contradiction lies in the arena of engaging the wealth and volume of input and experience into focusing the task rather than complicating it.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum reports Chicago breaks the back on annual state reports through Week II use of permeators. Brussels reports distributing program checks and handling finances for Madrid trek. Singapore reports posting and reconciling 14 bank accounts for March and April. Hong Kong reports obtaining new facility and moving on models for moving and renovating. Breakthroughs have to do with getting clear projections on year-end self-support situation to enable maneuvers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating time to do year-end reports in relation to Summer prep, House moves etc.

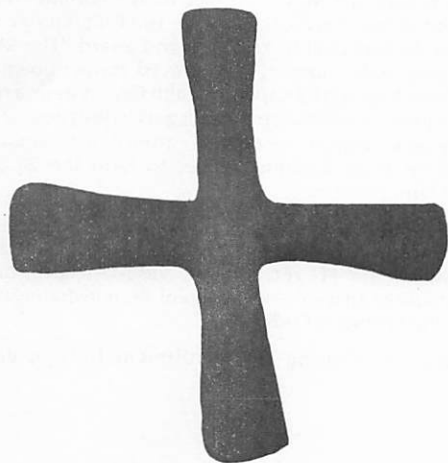
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

## LONDON

Success of campaign begins to be felt as one clergyman calls to request three Town Meetings in one day. Inkind trip to American Embassy and local colleges nets six filing cabinets, tables and 364 pieces of china (mostly soup bowls).

Internal: House sends out Sr. Joyce Blackwell after two-week sojourn and welcomes Robert Rank and Margarita Farid for Development blitz.

Contradiction: Articulating the victory of the quarter in order to release the concrete vision for the next two months and name the death ground. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Last two Town Meetings of the region happen through the Roman Catholic network with regional family team carrying the ball. Global Film Nights bring together neighbors and colleagues in Glasgow and Edinburgh.

Internal: Ruth Dyhr's mother comes for brief holiday and bakes for Evening at the Institute.

Contradiction: Shifting gears for next phase of every which way but loose. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: The Miracle Month of May begins with village entrance miracle—a new welcome sign, village directory, white stone road edging and repairs plus a beautiful new mural. Stake calls determine future miracles and line up muscle power.

Internal: House watches on TV the drama of the election of first woman head of government in the West.

Contradiction: Building momentum around Management Board to enable articulation of their victories. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Three circuits are manned by colleagues completing 21 TMs in TM Jubilee Campaign. House mails 107 follow-up letters to interested people and 25 to autumn possibilities.

Internal: Collegium on personal part of "Wall of Wonder" grounds power of charting.

Contradiction: Closing TM Jubilee Campaign in teh midst of ongoing TMs with follow-up in the hands of regions so as not to lose advantages gained. (Wk. 13)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: ICA receives 250 francs from Town Meeting held in February. House dispersed in three-fold continental maneuvers: Development, Town Meeting: Italy and an exploratory trip to Spain.

Internal: House concludes year by writing 300 report cards and pushing the aspects of trained warriors into a collegium 4 x 4.

Contradiction: Creating a missional thrust for Quarter I. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: First table comes off production line. August Vanistendahl addresses Superiors General on Development and the ICA. Sacred Heart General Chapter views the Global Film. Check for 350,000 lira arrives from Lady of Zion. House inkind three cars from L'Aquila car dealers for Town Meeting circuits. New workbook is printed.

Internal: Termine auxiliary moves to temporary housing and waits for breakthrough in permanent location.

Contradiction: Finding a place to live in the village so changed that everyone wants their houses. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

Internal: Shinn's report on Nairobi HDTs gives images of Africa's current situation.

Contradiction: Corporately enabling each centrum to complete its year. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

Contradiction: Getting the National Report contexted as to both global and local significance. (Wk. 13)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Caritas personnel attend *Gemeindeforum* in Vienna as first step in training to use the methos for Community Meetings through Austria. Development team turns its attention to religious orders. development team turns its attention to religious orders in Germany.

Internal: David Elliott stops over on his way back from HDTI in Kenya and brings nurturing reflections, stories and Kenya coffee.

Contradiction: Creating the systems and troop configurations in order to accept the many invitations for service. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: House contacts key persons of the Institute of City and Rural Development. Community erects a new Board of Directors for next year at first *Vereins* Meeting. Four TMs launch Berlin TM Campaign.

Internal: House finishes and mails GRA sessions to Chicago.

Contradiction: Discerning the point of history where the Project is right now in relationship to 1979-80 direction. (Wk. 13)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Large group of Zambian Chiefs visit KHDP and are overwhelmed. On seeing three-year old Shinondo, leading 160 preschoolers in songs and rituals, money is immediately pulled out of pockets for the school. The Chiefs judge the five stake shelters built by residents and award "The Most Outstanding Stake" award, an engraved copper bown, to Stake Three. Inspired by Kapini's Health Care system, a new course in primary health care for villagers is designed by the Ministry and village caretakers attend first session. Applications from Kapini families to farm the 20-acre irrigated farm come in.

Internal: House sends out Walter Nkana and Eusebio Muloshi, interns, to last week of HDTs in Nairobi and then on to Malawi for ITI recruitment. Vic Manchishi, once intern, sojourns on weekends at Kapini, demonstrating new style for the Extended Order.

Contradiction: Getting ITI recruitment fully in gear. (Wk. 13)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water gushing forth from *hanafeyas* (public water taps) in all six stakes drowns images of impossibility while the first complete toilet and shower block is opened for public use in the center of the village.

Internal: Presence of the Greg Farley family of four necessitates creation of a dorm for children who begin to impact the village through participation in preschool lesson planning and Arabic lessons.

Contradiction: Discerning the next peak to climb that will beckon village motivation now that water is accessible to every home. (Wk. 5)

External: Graduation of students from the Human Development Training Institute: Kawangware, Kenya is a great event with witnesses from the task forces that grounds all they had learned and what Human Development is all about. Commissioning of troops to Kawangware, Kamwelini, Ijede, Kapini and others to movemental forces points to victory of 100 in blue on the African continent.

Internal: Faculty celebrates at New Stanley Hotel following closing ceremony and evaluation of School with most fantastic meal ever served.

Contradiction: Transforming tiredness into solid visioning for the next 20 years and tomorrow. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

American staff and Harper children join in with 1,000 Americans for Memorial Day picnic. Son of the Canadian High Commissioner; Director of Dusan Tua, skills training camp five miles from project; and Barbara Anderson, TV actress of *Ironsides* fame, enjoy visit, including tea at Hasnah's house and lesson in putting on a sarong.

Internal: Canadian, Don Rutherford, on Asian tour hears about Project in Singapore and, knowing nothing about ICA, decides to come and stay at Project for several weeks.

Contradiction: Biting at the future while taking one step at a time forward and then absorbing it. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Government says yes to trek to East Java and supplies translator, housing and transportation. House meets with the director of Charoen Pokphand who helped start chicken industry and finds out he is director of thirteen companies.

Internal: House participates in great celebration with villagers and staff to send out Morris's for new assignment.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the Secretariat to be the leaders of the Project, making the big decisions. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Major emphasis is on agriculture as Bupati's (district officer) wife arrives with 30 others to encourage family vegetable gardens, demonstrate cooking nutritious food and present new games to preschool. Hoeing begins on one hectare demonstration garden. Two hectares are prepared for new coconut plantings. Contradiction: Finishing Mississippi with vigor while baiting Tennessee. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Jersey TM is held, a town of 400, and the mayor becomes so excited he pays the full \$200 for the program. GWF planning meeting with eight neighborhood representatives includes Economic Opportunity Atlanta, block club leaders and preschool directors. Macon County authorization maneuver sets appointment with state senator Ed Barker. Junior Leadership Atlanta CYF is held with 50 high school juniors in attendance from all the high schools in town. Program is sponsored by Georgia State University, Atlanta Chamber of Commerce and several other key agencies; participants call it the capstone of the year.

Internal: House celebrates three birthdays (everyone is now over the hill, 30) including Tim Lush's during the area prior trek in the region.

Contradiction: Creating imaginal form for the latter part of the quarter with only lots of things to do. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: House laminates 49 news articles on Gibson and Project, inkinds House numbers and wood for plaque, mails final invitations to June 16th celebration and makes three key framing visits that all indicate willingness to receive proposal for TM funding in 1979-80.

Internal: House moves into Pentacost with first complete ecclesiola in three weeks, welcomes Guardian Bib Dexter for June 16 preparation and rejoices in the House Church engagement announcement of Paul Schwobel and Carol Luker and their August 11 wedding plans.

Contradiction: Systematizing all the nitty-gritty tasks leading up to June 16 into an image of "everyday is a workday" without heaviness. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: First Miami Region Town Meeting Assembly draws representatives from five communities and is a splendid event. One man attends two TMs and the assembly and asks, "Why can't our company sponsor one of those HDPs for Seminole County?" Atlantic Bank contributes \$100. Sunday afternoon Bookertown Town Meeting draws 26.

Internal: All four House members are fully employed in an effort to raise enough money to enable everyone to attend the full summer program. One person is recruited and contributes \$200 toward goal of \$1000.

Contradiction: Building an objective model holding time and responsibilities to relieve pressured TMs, the Assembly and jobs between now and June 28. (Wk. 13)

## **CHICAGO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Troops continue to arrive and engage in the work of preparing for the GRA. Inkiond secures 30 sofa beds, 60 lamps, curtains, bedspreads, tablecloths and 6500 ice cream bars etc., with people calling to say "yes." Banner Tuckpointing begins cleaning the experor of the Kemper building. Staff return from Mississippi Assembly with the awe of having lived a great moment of history.

Internal: Collegiums on the Summer provide occasions for profound dialogue relative to the future.

Contradiction: Breaking down GRA preparation into small enough units of work so that the real chaos is exposed and dealt with. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: Fifth City Citizens Property Management Board holds a planning retreat to build management plan for HUD and the future. Mr. Bernstein visits Loop Training, Inc. and opens door for ICA to provide training through Mayor's Office of Education and Training. In Springfield a film preview is set up with Methodist Bishop as head of committee.

Internal: Twenty guests from East St. Louis and Wisconsin aid self-support and clean Trumbull.

Contradiction: Caring for assigned geography while being called out to consult with greater social networks. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Four metros decide to pick up task of sending letters to strongholds, a workday at Lorimor, plus schedules for global film showing.

Internal: House experiences a depth collegium on the summer program.

Contradiction: Developing metro autonomy and corporateness with the Religious House. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Six events, including Town Meetings, social methods presentations, LENS seminar and others are held. A LENS seminar is submitted to Minnesota Department of Administration which leaves only one or two state departments which have not yet had a forum or seminar conducted by the ICA.

Internal: The first LENS pedagogy to be held outside of Nexus since the new wave of LENS seminars began is held with 15 attentive participants.

Contradiction: Keeping manpower covenants increasing at the same rate that the programs are booked in order to do a thorough job of impact and follow-up on all fronts. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Looking at St. Louis' past and visioning for future signals need to make visits to major city agencies, resulting in helpful contacts with United Way, Regional Growth Association, East-West Gateway Planning Center and community development agency.

Internal: House covers the region, with trips to metropolitan St. Louis, Mill Shoals, Springfield, Carbondale, Columbia and Harris.

Contradiction: Discerning priorities for next two weeks' prime time. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Winning with CETA involves securing consultation fees for Labor Market Orientation of 100 youth from four counties and getting another full-time salary to do the Project.

Internal: Regional taskforce cultivates one acre of market garden and begins completion of auxiliary fence and participates in five Week II conversations and 10 media screenings.

Contradiction: Scheduling events as powerful as the Consult to catalyze local leadership for the second year. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: Seventy-five people from 31 communities converge on Kinney for the first annual Local Communities on the Move Conference. Two hundred celebrate at the pig roast and dance that night. Sunday morning's reflection by excited new colleagues occasions mayor of Gilbert, Minnesota, (Kinney's Iron Range neighbor) to challenge "Hold the annual conference in Gilbert next year, and we'll show you a town on the move!" That same weekend, Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission grants \$7,600 to ICA for the Conference and follow-up.

Internal: Chicago, Minneapolis, Richgrove, Lorimor and Cincinnati enable Kinney's conference and around the edges conversations foreshadow the GRA and Council agenda.

Contradiction: Turning excited program leaders into those who care comprehensively for the whole Project. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Forty participate in House Church with Don Richards as celebrant to welcome him back from a year in Guatemala. A slide presentation follows the House Church.

Internal: House extends invitations to colleagues who can't make it to the GRA to participate as sojourners sometime during July.

Contradiction: Falling back on tried tactics rather than applying imaginal methods in doing GRA recruitment. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: House culminates six months' work with neighborhood association participating in the first annual neighborhood festival, complete with parade, beauty pageant, disco, talent show, carnival and ball attended by mayor. Senator Birch Bayh and Representative Andy Jacobs walk the entire parade, meeting residents. Presentations including global film to 20 State CAP directors provides an entree to the entire network which will enable strategic participation in national CAP convention in Indianapolis in October.

Internal: House welcomes back Jackie Speicher who set-up the 5th City Festival June 16th, probably setting a record for length of service in Merry Month of May activities.

Contradiction: Handling all the details involved in confirming the 60 program events already set up for Quarter I and II before the REsearch Assembly begins. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: *Bi-monthly Interchange* gets written, printed and ready for mailing along with special mailing to Summer '79 prospects.

Internal: Intensive House search produces elusive facility just in time for moving deadline.

Contradiction: Seeing the possibility that seemingly intruding programs in last two weeks of Quarter IV may be key to Quarter II maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: House kicks off the quarter with a CYF in Madison Heights involving 150 students from three high schools and a key Town Meeting in the Bay City stronghold attended by economic, political and cultural authorization.

Internal: House holds first rotating Saturday morning ecclesiola at Guardian's home to enable region to prepare for Global Research Assembly.

Contradiction: Operating out of missional need rather than convenience. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: GRA recruitment and visitation is done geographically by turf teams.

Internal: Documentation of TM: Cleveland inspires House to reorganize files to tell the TM story.

Contradiction: Inspiring Metro Council participants to go to the GRA. (Wk. 11)

### **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: An Evening with the Institute in St. James, Long Island, positions region for fall events with new colleagues and new stronghold family. Economic Development Meeting in Loisaida engages corporate Guardians. Development week plus one nets \$1500.

Internal: Larry and Mary Ward impact House with insightful collegiums out of their India experience: "The New Shape of Those Who Care" and "The New Spirit Motif of the Movement".

Contradiction: Discerning multi-option game plans based on present real position. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Gifts of youth and elders combine to make lively TM climaxing Butler stronghold.

Internal: Widen House joins Pittsburgh House for congregational dinner which opens week of wedding preparation.

Contradiction: Preventing unclarity about the fall to paralyze the present. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Development contacts 100 people in Buffalo. Global film is shown three times in region. Buffalo colleagues commit themselves to continue calling for third Buffalo Evening at the Institute at the end of the month.

Internal: House sparkles for Evening with the Institute.

Contradiction: Maintaining current-positioning throughout Quarter I. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: The Tuesday Council Meeting which set workdays and celebrations for the next six months for Ivy City is followed on Friday by the removal of the old sign on the former Greyline Building, the first step in the transformation of the abandoned warehouse into an industry.

a collegium series aimed at closing the gaps in missional engagement toward a "full and perfect" Quarter I.

Contradiction: Carving out time together for the teams to empower the corporate effectiveness of the Project, the community behind the summer plans and events. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Widen Youth Corp begins 32 hour work week and proves that space can be conquered. More empty houses are being moved into by returning Widenites and people are beginning to volunteer to maintain space if it can be cleared and mowed once.

Internal: Time design organizes life of House. Landlord agrees to the signing of a 12-month lease. Garden begins to pay off as spinach and lettuce appear on the table for dinner.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the dreaming and enthusiasm of the community and enabling them to bring them to fruition. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Fifty people from the SURE Uptown Community in Harrisburg hold a Town Meeting and come alive in the plenary when they create a timeline of their planned events and name June 25 as the date for the first follow-up meeting.

Internal: Reading State Representative Stephen Reed's letter of endorsement written to the governor's wife impacts House with his clear declaration of commitment to the ICA and to the Town Meeting Program.

Contradiction: Discerning the tactics and events that will shift the old images of the summer out of which society operates. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Coordinate departments in AT&T and Bell Labs participate together in LENS catalyzed by New Jersey colleague Ron Griffith. Fifty people attend an Indian dinner as follow-up to Evenings with the Institute.

Internal: Thirty-two cases of paper, all useable sizes and colors, are inked and the Linda Brock and Brian May wedding is enabled.

Contradiction: Discerning multi-option game plans based on the present real position. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: May's miracles are topped off by the completion and opening of the Chintz Cottage Thrift Store and Craft Outlet in the Corn Shop at which time Chapter II of the Starks History went on sale. Three community representatives sign contract to buy corn shop building and EDA pre-proposal is submitted for that purpose.

Internal: Miracle Month of May ends with colleagues from three stakes celebrating with late night dinner and four layer chocolate birthday cake the memories and expenditure of the Project's first year in Starks.

Contradiction: Getting a clear image of the legal forms in order to ask for specific ways of participating. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: House makes village adoption presentation to Trinity Church in Shelburne Falls, Massachusetts. GRA phoning and appointments continue. *Earthrise* pins are prepared for New York Area GRA contestants. ICA receives \$1640 in developed money.

Internal: House travels to New York City for May-Brock wedding.

Contradiction: Determining what will make for an eventful summer for House, colleagues and the region. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Awakening and demonstration campaigns move along with Binghamton Town Meeting and STEED loan closing.

Internal: Tuesday evening 16 week maneuver planing highlights new directions for Project and local campaigns.

Contradiction: Eliciting positive community response through visible signs such as playground creation. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Global film impacts old colleagues at Christ Episcopal Church, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and nurtures relationship of church to ICA programs.

Internal: House space recreation produces new look and new organization.

Contradiction: Creating an image of engagement for local colleagues over the summer. (Wk. 13)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Poster blitz recruits women for GWF "off the street" and nets \$15 in hand, while Development circuit nets 14 appointments and encompasses GRA and film event recruitment.

Internal: House experiences a week of effulgence and celebration as Lorne auxiliary move in and complete first draft of funding package for wood industry, temporary jobs keep getting lined up and the Daily Office room is put back into use after fire.

Contradiction: Focusing and timing the one week maneuver that will ensure decisive victory for GWF, film event and GRA. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Forty-five community agency people and local citizens attend the East York Community Forum set up by the community school, first urban Toronto Forum since 1975. Four regional TWCs say "yes" to GRA. YWCA women's network opens for GWFs in city and worldwide. Religious orders reveal readiness to fund Lorne with letters of credit for large amounts.

Internal: House attends Sudbury Regional Assembly and visits historic French River canoe route to the West on the way. Summer mobilization packets go out to Houses in area.

Contradiction: Turning the GRA emphasis from who is going from the Houses to who is going from the regions. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Sudbury Forum '79 rolls on with 16 done and at least 15 more set up. Staff of seven non-Order volunteers and Young Canada Works employees work out of Sudbury 2001 office. Past Forum (Lombardy) newsletter (N. Leeds) announces formation of community information and recreation guilds.

Internal: C. Smeathers, House godfather, puts in the garden. Evelyn Cousineau stays a week.

Contradiction: Using year's victories to secure program support structures for Quarter I maneuvers. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: The Merry Month of May is brought to a resounding conclusion with three gala film events with 25 Guardians in Bathurst, St. John and Fredericton. The sendout of Mr. Jesse Dixon who had come from South Carolina to spend three weeks sharing his expertise with the woodworking industry, registration of 50% of next year's first graders in the preschool first grade prep program and community leadership deciding to purchase house for auxiliary.

Internal: Emma Kirsten Francis makes her entry into the Merry Month of May, born Sunday May 27, rather than awaiting her June 1st scheduled date of arrival.

Contradiction: Creating occasions when the community wrestles authentically with their vision of the future and with their responsibility for bringing it off. (Wk. 13)

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: LENS course with Caracas as focus discloses love of city and broadens colleague base. *Foro Comunitario* in neighboring village of *El Pilar* draws together concerned citizens who are impacted by the Cano Negro demonstration. Movie "The World of Human Development" is shown at Evening with the Institute, LENS Seminar, the International High School, United Church Women's group and in Cano Negro. Water lines continue to go into every house in Cano Negro and bring drinking water to everyone. Next level of sanitation training and education is begun with parasite treatment.

Internal: Auxiliary discovers high mobility as reduction in staff leaves every member with a vehicle. Impact taskforce for LENS, including Jack Gilles, Pat Jones and Jim Kelly arrives and begins task of introducing LENS to Latin American companies and agencies.

Contradiction: Sustaining village momentum and journey while Caracas draws focus of auxiliary. (Wk. 12)

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Preparations accelerate for celebration of first year anniversary of Project in the midst of greenhouse expansion, completing foundation of new bakery, full speed ahead on swing contracts and special edition of *La Voz*. Community training scholarships for bakery manager, Aurelia Rodriguez, and preschool teaching staff arrive.

Internal: Community couple, Victor Caro and Margarita Lara, and two children decide to intern.

Contradiction: Eliciting full participation of the village in spite of the coming of colder weather and the prevalence of colds. (Wk. 13)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Town Meeting Brasil is launched as *Forum Comunitario* is held in Sao Jose do Rio Preto led by Brazilian Guardians, ITI grads and Order. Visits with State Secretaries of Agriculture and Health frame new state government. Planning BHDP first anniversary celebration continues to involve and excite a large number of adults.

Internal: House celebrates Diane Wolff's and Lela Campbell's birthdays in one Week II.

Contradiction: Shifting image of Project celebration to community celebration. (Wk. 13)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Anniversary celebration erupts in week of work and wonder, highlighted by first-ever ecumenical service led by Cayman Islands ITI grad, Rev. Lawrence Small. All day assembly led by stake leaders and five simultaneous stake workdays produce four new flower gardens, three resurrected ones, and a grand day of celebration, including fair, banquet, sports and all night dance. Guests include diplomatic representation from three continents (UK, Australia and USA), local public and private sectors and ITI host committee.

Internal: Mervis Edwards returns from Azpitia Consult standing tall and filled with stories of victory.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in place for July and August during the next 10 days, while raising \$6000 to finance it all. (Wk. 13)

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: The demonstration irrigation plot is prepared and new irrigation pipes are laid. A children's playground is created with the Nixon family as backbone of that Project. Seven truckloads of inkind bricks for the new bakery oven arrive and are unloaded. The steel structure of the industrial park building is up. Adams Gum Company provides \$500 for potable water.

Internal: House welcomes Ron Nixon family of West Palm Beach for a week's engagement in miracles. Ruth Landmann arrives to help undergird self-support with a teaching job at Guatemala American School. Order celebrates completed life of Nehemias Leon, colleague in Guatemala City.

Contradiction: Breaking loose sufficient funds to drill well in order to secure potable water in first year of Project. (Wk. 13)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP**

External: An explosion of activity following the Consult initiates the preschool, nightly English classes with over 100 in attendance, mail service, health clinic, *La Voz* the plaza laid out in white stones and *pisco* (brandy) distilling industry.

Internal: Luis Aburto, the mayor's son, is welcomed into the House as a sojourner. Twenty global consultants are sent out in a series of *gran fiestas*.

Contradiction: Creating initiation phase structures to catch up with acceleration pace. (Wk. 13)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Aetna Lifesays "yes" to proposal after 18 months of work. Hong Kong Jockey Club donates \$71,000 HK for Nam Wai Dental Clinic. General Electric Middle EAsT commits \$10,000 US after Bayad site visit. New York House hosts 40 people from 475 Riverside Drive (representing \$130,000 of proposals) for dinner and film event. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building the momentum which keeps building during the Quarter I.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the continued arrival of colleagues from around the globe toward GRA preparation. Hong Kong packs up and moves to a new location. The Phase I Program: "The Drama of Humanness '79" begins in full force as camp, trip, farm and project are launched, complete with printed T-shirts for all. Progress continues on the next volume of *The Journal*. The flood of arriving folk suggests that this summer will be a signal spirit and operational breakloose. The sense of global relatedness is intensified as repeated conversations suggest global consensus to profoundly give focus to the resurgence of this moment. The key contradiction lies in the arena of preparing for the GRA comprehensively in the midst of immediate practical demands.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports campaigns are still moving full steam ahead with centrum forces enabling five TMs in Ireland, two LENS in London, Mississippi Assembly concluding Mississippi 200 Campaign and set up of additional state campaigns for 1979-80. Programs break through with deepened frame and up-front funding in the offing. The key contradiction lies in the arena of handling field coordination and support while preparing for the GRA and Order Council.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that across the globe it is intensifying report preparation in anticipation of comprehensive global reports required for Global Order Council. Outside Chicago the blitz is on to arrange travel to the GRA and Council. Accounting to outside bodies for grants consumes Chicago. Publishing House gears up to produce massive printing output demanded in July. Global systems handle travel arrangements with no strain in the midst of increasingly complex airline rates and schedules. The key contradiction lies in the arena of an effective vehicle for including continents Africa and Latin America in global finance reports.
