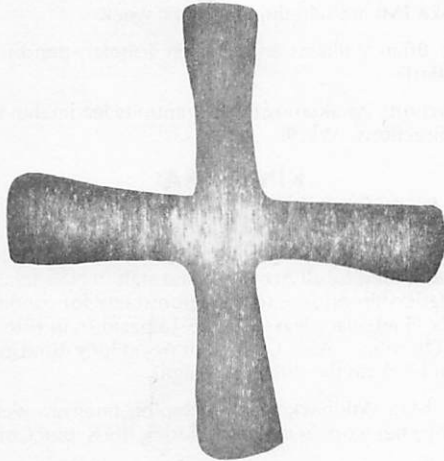

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Local delegates to Termine Europe Projects meeting report on event being great celebration with House. Major highlight is closing address in three languages. Visit to Intermediate Technology Industrial Services (ITIS) reveals great potential resource for HDPs around the globe for technical assistance in developing local industry.

Internal: Sr. Joyce Blackwell, Sacred Heart sister who met us first in Cano Negro, visits House and expresses serious interest in using methods in local community and with her Order.

Contradiction: Concentrating on finding the open doors instead of beating heads against the brick walls. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Local councils are visited nightly and a three-day blitz is set up for next week in Inverness to the north. Two ICA staff are appointed part-time regional education staff to facilitate upcoming CYFs. Old colleague chats for one and a half hours on Church and community after 10 year absence from Movement.

Internal: Two permeators and two cars put House into a new maneuvering potential.

Contradiction: Tripping over the practical, mundane stumbling blocks on the way to vision and strategies. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: PSU on capital funding with continent and area input results in regional Guardians night set-up, eight key appointments, seven more set and management board netting \$280 in garden materials orders. Polis coverage sets up Town Meeting for March 29th, initial sortie to Southampton polis and hits religious order for Development. Project accelerates with first three life-enrichment courses. Building materials are inkinded for youth building and youth participation increases in whole Project.

Internal: House hosts Paula Philbrook and Tom Greyslock from Operations, Don and Claudia Cramer from London and welcomes Susan Gordon-Smith, a two-week sojourner from Canberra, Australia.

Contradiction: Maturing the leadership base such that intensity of activity does not overwhelm. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Gateshead Week II TM set-up blitz begins to break loose cluster TM possibilities and "reborn" regional colleagues have a great time.

Internal: Regional colleagues handle child care as House adult members do TM Week II blitz and Continental Council.

Contradiction: Internalizing revolutionary urgency for all activities. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: National/international frame crystallizes with visits to the Foreign Affairs Ministry, French Committee on Hunger and Development and to UNESCO's Education Department on Rural Development. House sends two to Brussels for Wallonia TM Maneuver.

Internal: House experiences pause that refreshes with Vinod Parekh and John Patterson over cocktails.

Contradiction: Building a frame which elects practical engagement. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: ICA: Italy annual report is completed. The bureaucratic systems holding permission for reconstruction of industry building electricity and closeout of Leblanc Woodwork and opening of cooperative books get consolidated attack. They begin to relent and next week should relinquish, to allow complete legal, operating industry to move ahead.

Internal: House sees *Superman* in Italian and reflects on Twentieth Century myths.

Contradiction: Building the models that allow full participation of the auxiliary and cooperative. (Wk. 9)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: The great week of launching agriculture begins with delivery of 1,000 naira (\$1,500 US) worth of chicken feed, followed by delivery of 1,200 chicks by Agric, the Ministry of Agriculture, which catalyzes an impromptu chicken house built by Achaji Salu. The Manpower Administration Manager of Pioneer Metal Company visits to inspect the partially completed new poultry building in preparation for granting inkind request for roofing. Co-op stores and Kingsway stores request sewing industry samples, while the Ministry of Trade and Co-operatives enlists 38 founding members of the Ijede Co-Op. On the weekend, a fifty-woman GWF is held in Lagos at St. Paul's Church, while new CYF orchestrators, Jago and Coleman, pull off three events.

Internal: First of injection of new troops from Kenya, Peter Malaba, arrives and catalyzes demonstration auxiliary garden.

Contradiction: Initiating economic programs in midst of fear and uncertainty. (Wk. 7)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Funding/framing treks are made in Flanders (Belgium), the Netherlands and Paris while Operations works with Tai'rgwaith on economic development. Charles Hahn is sent out to Bombay Nexus internal audit.

Internal: Nexus fulfills its global role as preparations begin for Global Management Centrum band meeting.

Contradiction: Making systems produce on time to meet deadlines for global reporting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Brussels hosts Management band meeting (second in a series of three band meetings).

Internal: House sends out Desmond Balm to Development Centrum: Bombay after victorious week of religious order visits.

Contradiction: Serving the continued demands of the areas while preparing for another band meeting, two councils and a Guardians meeting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House initiates two maneuvers, visits seven polises and sets up three TMs, including the first in the city of Haarlem. Iet van der Linden, Dutch colleague, does solo TM workshop and then dashes for train to get to her 11 pm night shift.

Internal: Saturday is a fine event with permeators out on circuits and Week I circuiters preparing House for Saturday night ecclesiola (a first).

Contradiction: Spending enough time in the turf to develop the winning strategy, yet maintaining the speed required for polis coverage. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Elizabeth, Manfred and Berthold teach German RS-1 to TM participants and Kreuzberg Ost volunteers. Reflection emphasizes its formulation power and this gets dramatized by (nearly) unsolicited contributions. Government volunteer agency approves four ICA projects (Kreuzberg Ost, Tai'rgwaith, Termine and Kawangware) for work camps in August with funded pre-training in Frankfurt.

Internal: Bob Rank comes back in town to assist House in making its Development bottom line for the third consecutive month.

Contradiction: Keeping polis coverage as number one priority when Movement building demonstrates its jealousy. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: First Guardians meeting on Kreuzberg Ost Cafe is held. Bishop Kruse gives complete authorization for Berlin to TMs, while Berlin and Kreuzberg Ost TMs are held and two more stake TMs are scheduled for next week.

Internal: Brian Williams and Warren Tolman spend framing week in Berlin.

Contradiction: Awakening the community leadership to new Project directions. (Wk. 9)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: "Rise-Up Africa" is the spirit of the Bi-Continental Council attended by all Area Kinshasa staff in Nairobi. Kapini village leadership assume total responsibility for running the Project as 15 auxiliary leave for the Tamzam train ride to the council. On return, Area Council draws in long-time grads to Kapini for work on the three campaigns.

Internal: Meg Wildhack reaches Kapini, finally, a welcome return since her work as educator during the Kapini Consult.

Contradiction: Re-creating comprehensive Project picture in midst of community move to become engulfed in particular programs that are high-security, low-risk. (Wk. 5)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Pipes connecting water tank to well are in place after marathon work day. All stakes initiate work and timelines for toilet and showers.

Internal: Margreet Farid is sent out to Europe and Phil Kneisley arrives to "green" the desert.

Contradiction: Training the leadership for now, while preparing them for the world's accountability. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Officials from Ministry of Commerce and Industry visit Kawangware and talk with chairman of Kawangware Co-Op Society regarding multi-purpose co-op and need for this to be model for nation. Kawangware businessmen meet over dinner to discuss commercial area in village and are ready to move on its revitalization. Kawangware Co-Op Society management committee and industry managers meet twice over dinner to work through budgets and working relationships between themselves, ICA and granting/loaning agencies, particularly the administration of ATI loan and industry expansion. Great day in Kabiro (focus stake) has over 100 adults participating in five food groups demonstration, 85 babies weighed and eight HCT registered. Rotary International Director visits to affirm funds for local project of nursery school construction. Industrialist Guardian returns to guild meeting for second time and goes home with an assignment along with community people. Government LENS is turning out to be major event in Machakos (district in which Kamweleni is located).

Internal: House holds a late night picnic in re-designed collegium room where lights flicker out and close evening.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on the key actions for every maneuver as a life and death imperative. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Maliwada leadership generates economic ventures—a new brick factory and a *huann* shop (food store), which keeps adding items to its stock. The preschool is reactivated and many children are participating. As one of six spotlights for January, Maliwada hosts four ladies from Chikole and two from Kendur—one a graduate of the first HDTS. The HDTS *shramdam* produces a garden, foundation for Emerging Generation building and *bund* construction.

Internal: A collegium on the new form of management addresses ashram with thought of 2,500 villages next year.

Contradiction: Releasing new forms of water supply as wells go dry very early this year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Newly assigned strike force teams meet to plan four-week campaign in the six spotlight villages. Teams sent out and meet back on weekend to finalize timeline, bringing enthusiastic villagers with them to help in planning.

Internal: Nexus received the first contingent of Management Centrum into Bombay to prepare for audit.

Contradiction: Equipping the troops on the field to do effective and catalytic actuation, not just for one village but for the 232. (Wk. 5)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Five villagers are cleared to receive Rs5,000 agricultural loans each on Republic Day. Sugar factory agrees to buy village cane crop at double the price received locally. Stake meetings begin. Visit by Block Development Officer assures of his firm support.

Internal: Sripal, a village youth, dies and auxiliary and villagers celebrate his completed life.

Contradiction: Locating permanent village facility and formalizing guild structures to unblock tactical thinking. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water

supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Mobile area council happens when decision is made not to be blocked by being unable to get everyone to one location. Canara and Indian Overseas Bank commit themselves to support of Bihar Project, as framing and authorization visits continue.

Internal: House broods on immediate and long-range vision as Panchayat Visitation comes to Area Calcutta.

Contradiction: Preparing effectively for Project initiation while still finalizing Consult date. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Nexus completes brief with wisdom of advocate who is chartered accountant as to procedure of legal base. *Chingay*, Chinese New Year, celebration procession, along with invitation to celebrate at Singaporean colleague's home impacts House with multi-traditional cultural gifts.

Internal: Rebstock family is sent out to San Francisco to enable Singapore Nexus self-support.

Contradiction: Forging new image of appropriate service in the nation. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: House creates structure formats to do planning and implementing quickly.

Internal: Harry arrives, Mudj is sent out and Judy starts work.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive planning while moving 100,000 miles an hour. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI

External: Agricultural complex area gets cleaned up and grounds mowed as fence is finally delivered after months of struggling to complete complex. ICA demonstration pathways are complete and look great. The *pasar* (market) committee in 30 minutes time commit themselves to \$600 toward a \$1,000 purchase from MARA which allows purchase on the basis of 60% cash. Work on MARA Bamboo Industrial Complex is right on schedule. Site visits include 20 from the Kuala Lumpur Rotary, and five youth led by daughter of multi-millionaire Indian and her visiting Japanese friends. First developed monies for the month (\$250) come in from Serusup.

Internal: Special dessert at the end of ecclesiola is surprise gift of celebrating George Yost's 58th birthday.

Contradiction: Creating maximum flow of information with many villagers. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village methods training module has 34 villagers and ten auxiliary to nine sessions over four days. Guild formation and timeline of quarter priorities are broken loose by Week 5 consensus assembly.

Internal: House enjoys discontinuous boat trip to Melaka Straits Island.

Contradiction: Organizing auxiliary to follow up village priorities as well as possible fallout from government LENS and one University Forum. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: In the great week of preparing the ground, the economic survey is finished to prepare data for USAID proposal. The preschool parents' meeting reveals enthusiasm about further education for their children, which had been questioned. The ICA and Bontoa story and slides are shared at a meeting of the foreign funding agencies in South Sulawesi. LPPM, the nearby rice research institution blitzes the fertilizer demo plot donated by local farmer.

Internal: House tackles a self-support workshop and lays a plan, and closes the week with day of fasting.

Contradiction: Relating specific guild activities to total Project structures. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Sue Oberg is sent out to Singapore Nexus for three-day internal Management Centrum systems check.

Internal: House celebrates announced decisions of an ecclesiola guest to come weekly and Mary Kaye Heisler to sojourn.

Contradiction: Discerning engagement patterns that maximize all human resources. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: House picks up HK\$20,000 check for Nam Wai dental clinic. Four more village women turn up for antique fashion belt sewing industry. Village youth send newsletter to surrounding villages.

Internal: House sends out one-month Chinese sojourner to India.

Contradiction: Making moves over the abyss in midst of lack of data on dental clinic and land development. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guard says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: First GCF training session is held with YMCA staff to do 60 TMs throughout Philippines. Electrification of second Project is accomplished through in-kind of two kilometers of wire. House receives order for Sudtonggan craft from largest Philippine exporter.

Internal: New Year brings expanded English teaching schedule as House makes self-support for the month.

Contradiction: Obtaining water for Langub. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Materials on the local economic vehicle and projection of enterprises over next three years in Hai Ou are prepared for consultation with Guardians on legal forms now needed in Taiwan to support the Project in the corporate economic development of the village.

Internal: Priors of Taipei and Kaohsiung (Hai Ou) Houses meet for corporate planning during Chinese Lunar New Year celebration.

Contradiction: Getting on the road to the 20 cities and counties while covering the Management and Development functions of the House. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: House sends out an army to the front with all in battle position within one hour in five locations. At the same time, four support teams are launched—health, preschool, utilities, industry—each to be in one village each week. Each performs miracles, i.e., 450 enrolled in four new preschools, possibility of immediate employment of 1,000 women, electricity within two weeks in one village. At same time, operations band is activated with the total funding of the Mactan 216 GCF Maneuver in March, and the completion of the 648 GCF design for the Philippines to be completed by July.

Internal: First week of House in five locations finds each one doing common ecclesiola (called Roundtable).

Contradiction: Creating comprehensive decor that holds focus and releases expenditure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New building for the general store goes up as store expands stock, making it the first place in Langub to have staples like rice and corn. Singer offers installments and discounts on sewing machines which would allow 15 women in the sewing industry to own their own machine in two years. Sewing building is also completed. Loan proposal is submitted to Development Bank of the Philippines for brick industry start-up capital, and Ben Potot begins training in technical process of brick making. Agriculture guild begins direct compost pits which catch on quickly. Over 100 turn out for community workday on road maintenance. Coke donates new signs for the programs. University of Mindanao sends students to work in Langub and donates flowers, tins, paint and plywood for beautification.

Internal: Development team arrives as first guest in new guest room and gives exciting reports from Cebu.

Contradiction: Keeping up with the things that are moving faster than anticipated. (Wk. 7)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Development leaps into a new orbit with TM sponsorship package. Monthly Guardians dinner at the House has 12 around the table with every Guardian volunteering for particular assignments. Visit to Village and Town Mayors' Association opens access to 2,600 mayors in Japan's smaller communities.

Internal: Masayo Koshiyama moves in, and Hiroshi Fukuyama arrives from Oyubari for ten days of Development and framing work.

Contradiction: Turning enormous advantages into visible victories. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Preschool re-opens after winter holiday with curriculum planned to ready kindergarten children to enter first grade in March. Village leadership firms plans for assembly and sets February 8 as annual "prayer" date.

Internal: RS-I weekend with nine sojourners and six auxiliary grounds in Christian symbols.

Contradiction: Discerning the rhythm and flow of events in the village to be able to effectively catalyze globality. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House completes first leg of Chu-Goku Chi Ho Maneuver with five TM events: on Saturday, one TM with Shimonoseki Jaycees Chapter, and another with Jujido Company in Shimonoseki with 20 people. On Sunday, there are two more TM events in Sogo (Okayama-Ken) with 27 people and in Fukuoka, Yoshizuka Roman Catholic Church. In Nagasaki, a TM training event with 20 people is held.

Internal: House celebrates Masahito Tonosaki's beginning of his intern year at House Church.

Contradiction: Discovering when maneuver is finished in order to move quickly across nation and finish TMs. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: The Chu Goku Chi Ho TM National Maneuver keeps two on the road as part of three teams and brings an enthusiastic support from regional colleagues "at home" through introductions and funding. Newsletter (grass roots Development) and women's event invitations are sent out in record time with the help of the new inkind TANAC addressing machine and many local women who write all the addresses in Japanese on the coding cards.

Internal: Neighborhood care addresses House with gifts of oranges, strawberries, meat, juice and circus tickets for the children as well as someone to take the children to the circus.

Contradiction: Deciding that in the midst of the ambiguous there's no clear-cut decision, but that the decision is the necessary act. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: The House hosts Community Youth Forum of 18 for 24-hour program with college students who wrestle seriously with vocational question. Rotary speaking engagement in Sapporo gives new credibility to work with important Guardians.

Internal: House sends out Mr. Tonosaki as new intern of the Order to the Tokyo House and welcomes Miss Okuda for a month-long sojourn.

Contradiction: Pushing winter activities in Oyubari. (Wk. 8)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: First colleague event of the new quarter is held and House shines with new decor. Development sets Week 7 appointments and receives Esso grant of \$1,000. Cablemakers Company of Sydney orders 500 mattress covers from Murrin Bridge sewing industry.

Internal: Ecclesiola is highlighted by creating goose riddles to send to Vogar.

Contradiction: Coordinating the bedazzling array of troops coming and going, while focusing on the House's regional mission—especially CMA. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch Year of Australia at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Four days of phoning yields ten strong names for state committee for the South Australian campaign, which in turn enables the brochure to go to print.

Internal: House transformation proceeds with office re-organization and reinstatement of the prayer room.

Contradiction: Pulling swimsuits up while leading a three-lap race. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: CTC strike force of Barry Oakley and Terry Weygandt arrive to collect \$100 from state committee member and \$500 from Nabisco as the first of their annual gifts for 1979 and 1980. Transrational models for state campaigns are taking new forms.

Internal: Finance forms are brought up to date and ready for audit.

Contradiction: Forging regional models that will release Area Council consensus without pre-empting that consensus. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Phone calls in two nights from Brussels, Singapore, Hong Kong, Bombay and all around Australia on authorization emphasize globality of Development. House returns from area council and then three out of four adults disappear to other cities on TM and HDP assignments. Internal: House hosts Sue Chapman's parents for dinner to celebrate Sue's engagement to John Burbidge and for all four to discuss wedding preparations.

Contradiction: Getting state campaign names quickly. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Whole House participates in Adelaide Area Council. First corporation check (\$250) for CMA arrives from Hastings Verring. Long weekend holiday enables House to set up for "Mango Tango" CMA maneuver.

Internal: House transforms nine rooms in "Path of Glory" blitz.

Contradiction: Connecting the vitality of the mission to colleagues' lives. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: A community meeting place is created on the site of the proposed community hall, and a two-week community methods training workshop for community leaders is launched. Major wins in industries set-up include an initial contract for sewing 500 mattress covers, positive commitment from Edgells to work through a market garden contract, and inking of welding and wood-working equipment. Saturday workday creates a now much-used adventure playground.

External: Nation comes to the village through a two-year dental experimental program for the school children. District doctor will visit weekly, and Rotary member offers help of club members. Two stakes demonstrate corporate action with continuing daily work on pig fence and completion of nursery and garden.

Internal: New teaching job at Morman College provides sufficient funds to meet budget and release creativity for other arenas.

Contradiction: Allowing the village to see that new life in Salani is based on their decision and creativity. (Wk. 8)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Thirty-three regional colleagues gather at San Francisco for a great evening "tribal" meeting with the Panchayat and are impacted with reports on the state of the Movement, Guardian role and India replication.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation presence and role in enabling global visioning and local strategizing revitalizes House to step on it once again in the urban "long march".

Contradiction: Doing weekly maneuver writing on the broad arenas which utilizes all that House knows and engages all available. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Capitalization visits are made on behalf of the CCDA. Adult education classes are set to begin February 22.

Internal: House joins with the community in the pain of awakening and the struggle with relating to reality.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with shadows under super fire. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Cascade Eclipse Maneuver moves into second phase of "Moving the Moon" with ten events completed. In one small town, entire senior class of 11 students attends evening TM, then asks orchestrator to come into classroom next day for two hours where they work through plans for implementing their contribution to the community before they graduate and leave town.

Internal: House receives 37 confirmed reservations for Movemental event during Panchayat visit; in midst of calling one family of five decides to attend House Church.

Contradiction: Recognizing and stating the victory in each of the strongholds. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

Contradiction: Attacking with program when can hardly believe the breadth of possibility where local man is rising again. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Buffalo Head Youth Club returns from successful California trip, after raising all their expenses.

Internal: Ecclesiola conversation on totality is strong impact on auxiliary who live holding comprehensiveness amidst the myriad of details.

Contradiction: Keeping vision on future while trying to complete all the programs activated. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: A brand-new newsletter is mailed to 360, combining the Billings regional letter with the continental Campaign News, made possible by a revised mailing list.

Internal: A morning House Church of only bread and wine is intensified discontinuity for House.

Contradiction: Keeping strategies clear over the long range, while doing maneuvers of indirection. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP
External: Thelma Shelltrack departs for HDTs proudly wearing a hand-beaded medallion depicting the grid of Cannon Ball and Inyan Wakagapi (place of sacred markings). The industry crew unloads the first shipment of boxes for Trash-Barro orders.

Internal: Winter blizzard catalyzes "left undone" tasks at the House, and brings on a cutthroat game of Hearts.

Contradiction: Hip-pocketing good ideas and moving swiftly on program priorities. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Newsletter is mailed, Kiwanis at Boulder see presentation by four metro colleagues on Cusick trip, and Morning with the Institute at UMCW meeting set pace for a week. Development visits Denver and Casper. Laramie maneuver steering committee meets and sets training date. Brighton training promises ten bright, committed workshop leaders.

Internal: Steak pie, prepared by colleague, is delightful entree for evening meal after TM training for Brighton maneuver.

Contradiction: Enabling four different maneuvers in four different stages while ensuring quality TMs, quality training and quality nurture. (Wk. 9)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Movement formation moves ahead with fine Evening at the Institute and visit with Oblate Provincial.

Internal: Images expand as House studies the report on women in ecclesiola, and Week II conversations focus on the seven revolutions.

Contradiction: Creating effective operating images of saturation in midst of all troops focused on self-support victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Nanaimo Maneuver gathers speed with the inkinding of 146 lunches for CYF, 26 staff meals and six hotel rooms, Development promise of \$100 from Macmillan-Bloedel local office and other school making preparations for a CYF.

External: Visit to Parklands results in six hours of saturation planning with key organization director.

Contradiction: Moving beyond a one-to-one relationship in TM set-up. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Housing and health survey visits 131 households out of 210 in Stakes I and II. Research trip is made to Piedras Negras about possible canning products. Asherton is on funding schedule for sewage system to begin in 90 days. Spanish newspaper with article on Asherton is given to every house in town.

Internal: House holds collegium on shadows.

Contradiction: Building the third economic maneuver to crack the economic monolith. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Several arenas begin to swirl with the first week of the Indianoma Maneuver, the initial circuit to Tulsa anticipating first Movemental core meeting, and continuation of the urban probe in Oklahoma City with neighborhood TMs.

External: Ten TMs are set up in Marksville maneuver. Five thousand leaflets are printed and distributed in Leesville.

Internal: New Orleans cadre meets with House after House Church to plan New Orleans maneuver.

Contradiction: Coordinating TMs and CYFs through precision orchestration, set-up and training. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mississippi: 200 rolls on with mass mailing from the Governor's office. Academy is cared for with brochure mailing from House.

Internal: First House Church with entire House is celebrated in Memphis in 1979.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time and resources in order to do the tactics which maintain momentum. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Wilmington Maneuver finishes five events with four more set. Inking goes well in Wilmington, procuring housing, food and tire. Atlanta sets practices for April CYF and has Friday task force. Fifteen say yes to second Imaginal Education course. Augusta Foray gives necessary feel for maneuver events.

Internal: Ecclesiola enables House to create high quality montage for India.

Contradiction: Building Augusta frame and setting up events at the same time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Momentum leaps forward as the community center gets yet another face life. The first Saturday children's movie hour and songfest is held. Bob St. Clair pushes long-range economic plans down the road. Stake leadership comes alive, and numerous TMs are held.

Internal: The House spins with overflow of guests at steak ecclesiola dinner as VW blows up and nine-inch snowstorm blows through.

Contradiction: Grounding the operational images of the quarter in order to channel people's decision-making power. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Creating the maneuver plan that involves dispersed colleagues, formulates new colleagues and ensures comprehensive coverage. (Wk. 9)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: First-time use of global film on a Development circuit clarifies film conversation construct, introduces prospective patrons to ICA and catalyzes a \$1200 gift. The 16 consultants for Maharashtra Month are named. Project finances manual nears completion. Four copies of global film are sent to Global Operations band meeting.

Internal: Pilot retreat is held on Week II for 28 Nexus participants.

Contradiction: Recreating ICA story to reflect the new missional functions in ever-expanding public orbits. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: The 1979 CDBG funding for environmental and housing programs reaches \$51,400. Commercial school graduates this class.

Internal: HDTs guilds are formed and begin plugging into Fifth City HDP programs.

Contradiction: Grasping the objective to attack as a result of comprehensive up-front plans. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

House receives positive reception in Nebraska to TM when contacted for first time since last spring. A dozen colleagues stay after House Church to participate in building a regional Academy recruitment plan.

Internal: The Panchayat's visit includes fantastic Movement dinner, a restful House excursion and two authorization luncheons.

Contradiction: Unblocking "he is the only one who can do x" syndrome. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Minneapolis Metro organizes itself into three guilds in order to meet the coordination needs of the upcoming wave of forums, demonstration and formulation: urban replication guild, global interchange and Guardianship guild, and the local community networking guild.

Internal: Saturday is spent in rehearsing the victories of the quarter while pounding out the regional newsletter in one day.

Contradiction: Creating the initial demonstration events without getting sucked into fighting the local wars and over-researching. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: First Economic Community Forum results in town reaching consensus that its population (now 600) will double in next ten years. Colleagues surprise House by talking to city officials about TM during lunch hour.

Internal: Week II full of engagement (ecclesiola, completing 20 TM packets, workshop on quality TMs) encourages colleague engagement Friday through Sunday.

Contradiction: Completing coal country stronghold and moving to next saturation area. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Inkind flow continues for preschool with new furnace, paint and asbestos walls this week, while youth service force holds skating and pizza party with 30 present.

Internal: First TM in the Mill Shoals stronghold is a great success as local opposition arises to stop other TMs.

Contradiction: Dealing with HDP opposition spill-over into stronghold. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

Contradiction: Choosing the geography with the greatest potential. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: La Crosse, Indiana reports that in eight weeks since their TM, they have decided to meet regularly, elected officers, published a self-supporting newsletter with a five-person staff and negotiated with the telephone company for a new switching system to be installed by April 1. Contradiction: Creating a maneuver for spring to deal with the rest of geography and ready it for next year's saturation. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Forty-five interior design and architect students plus faculty advisors of the University of Kentucky see human development slide show and methods demonstration, resulting in several signing up for engagement and entree to American Society of Interior Design network.

Internal: House anticipates Development week by making decor, getting appointments, and celebrating the victory in advance.

Contradiction: Seeing saturation as historical necessity, both locally and globally. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Circuits reveal colleagues from TMs ready to do more in three new strongholds.

Internal: Research Centrum: Academy visits for days of planning actuation, giving House a focus around which to do several third campaign tactics.

Contradiction: Establishing image of regular circuit presence. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Fourth Codell TM begins with announcement of \$200,000 raised and a list of community accomplishments since first TM in January 1976.

Internal: CETA salary is secured for John Poole to work full-time on TM.

Contradiction: Sorting out the complexity of troops and time organization in three locations. (Wk. 8)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Two special issues forums are held in Loisaia. Three community forums and one GWF have dates set in Smithtown.

Internal: Sophie Sollberger returns from HDTS to move into the House as an intern.

Contradiction: Dealing effectively with management of House and facility in order to utilize all available forces in the saturation campaign. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Forays into three counties kick off three saturations.

Internal: Five weeks of framing the Pittsburgh printing world results in fine job offer.

Contradiction: Creating long-range timelines in midst of ambiguity, refusal and fear. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Week is spent wrapping up Development effort by recording data. First new pledges arrive and follow-up appointments are kept.

Internal: Valentine's Day provides occasion for House to celebrate life together in 77.7% Phase I House.

Contradiction: Finding catalytic ways to engage metro core with regularity. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

Also uncovered is a former resident, later Assistant Police Chief, who wrote book on growing up in Ivy City.

Contradiction: Assigning tactics and implementaries to the maneuver arenas. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: To date, structures have been created to engage 40 people (16.6%) on a weekly or fortnightly basis.

Internal: Panchayat visit provides global context and includes great celebration.

Contradiction: Giving visible form to community structures. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Development intensification week demonstrates power of raising \$144 from Project director's stipends.

Internal: House makes 100 phone calls, 23 visits and eight more this week, expanding vision of who is out there.

Contradiction: Integrating new Development momentum into increasing saturation set-up demands. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Two special issues forums are held in Loisaia. Three community forums and a GWF are set with dates in Smithtown.

Internal: House experiences new life with the presence of Operations, Development and Research Centrum forces.

Contradiction: Dealing effectively with management of House and facility in order to utilize all available forces in the saturation campaign. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Visit to HOME, Inc. by eight community ladies scouts out this potential market for cottage industry and to Kennebunkport by the Agriculture Guild researches applied uses of windmills. During a Saturday workday, ten parents paint, scrape and install a donated heating system in the house where the Little Peeps Playgroup will be held. That evening over 30 people see the New England premiere of the film, *Human Development Around the World*.

Internal: The extended visit of Nexus to Starks this week provides a tremendous boost in the form of training methods, public relations, and a marathon Sunday night planning session.

Contradiction: Communicating the excitement the core group and auxiliary has about current projects to the community as a whole. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: House holds first in a series of community workshops (GCFs) in Hartford for neighborhoods within political voting districts. First project is a field trip to municipal offices to begin voter education and is slated for March. House holds second and third training sessions for the local workshop leaders who staffed it.

Internal: House caps off busy week by seeing *Superman*.

Contradiction: Getting all strongholds moving so as to increase visibility and impact. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Development week is launched with regional celebration including TM cluster planning and claiming of promises. Two surprise checks bring cash in-hand to over \$1,200 to date. Moving on the firewood industry is symbolized by obtaining \$1,000 in loan money and orders for 250 cords of wood.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: David (Chairman of the Board CICA) and Ann Patterson come to ecclesiola in preparation for the Panchayat Visitation to Australia. Visits in urban metro Toronto reveal local church consultation possibilities and possible Project situations on Indian reserves in Ontario.

Internal: House celebrates St. Valentine's Day with wine and cheese and a get-together of family and friends.

Contradiction: Being actively patient while not sitting back and waiting for things to happen. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Portland forum kicks off North Leeds Development days. Sudbury committee decides on 15 forums for April. Multi-cultural youth action forum in Thunder Bay proposes cross-community student exchange program.

Internal: Feverish preparation of new forum workbook causes strange and unearthly time design.

Contradiction: Refining saturation strategy to produce crowds as well as events. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Community moves up front with LEDC community staff carrying major roles in funding proposal presentation to government review board. Three attend Atlantic trade fair with diversified product line, and Lorne HDP board meets in new formation.

Internal: House learns valuable lesson about promptness in legal matters as one car is impounded by RCMP due to illegal status.

Contradiction: Giving staff time to job search while more than full staff assigned is needed for funding, economic acceleration and living environment push. (Wk. 8)

External: Foro (TM) state caravans are launched Monday and in first week one Foro is done and two set. Community youth have a day at the beach.

Internal: House's storeroom jungle is reclaimed.

Contradiction: Keeping news conversation alive when ionosphere blocks shortwave. (Wk. 7)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Five corn festivals, one in each sector at the same time, cement neighborhood identity, while local women engage in preparations for a women's event, and the sewing industry taps a local market by taking orders for school uniforms.

Internal: Discontinuity day assignments start up again this year.

Contradiction: Keeping the whole picture in sight while compartmentalizing for depth. (Wk. 8)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Parasite testing program sends 35 feces to the pharmacist and treats first 12 for worms. Six Bananeiras students are registered for fifth grade in Silva Jardim, the community's first students to go beyond fourth grade. Special tutoring for these students becomes a daily highlight in the summer school program. Okra from the experimental farm goes to market, and another community garden is started by summer school students. Day-long rains wash out local bridge with bus on the other side, thus requiring use of auxiliary truck as community emergency vehicle. Voice is distributed.

Internal: Staff carries on daily visitation routine in up-to-the-knees mud and daily downpour.

Contradiction: Maintaining contradictory focus in the midst of doing maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides, and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Belingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction, and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Development team arrives two weeks early and enables auxiliary to undergo missional mitosis, with one team developing funds and authorization and the other continuing work on electricity, irrigation, wells and sector leadership.

Internal: The departure of Phil Holmes after one month's work which netted two demonstrations of drip irrigation and lots of practical insights, reminds House that this is a global Movement.

Contradiction: Sustaining Development thrust by engaging new contacts in the substance of global/local social demonstration. (Wk. 9)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a week of both break-open events and follow through results as check for \$3800 arrives from Department of Labor, Michigan, and Bay City, Michigan sets up demonstration forum for \$200. Ten metro cadre people in Detroit Region support the new India village Project directors at \$144 each. Mrs. Bedell sets up appointments and Ivy City site visits with key authorization figures. Eight people raise some \$5,000 and leave for Maharashtra and Roy Stansbury arrives. February grassroots mailing from Chicago nets \$800 in first two days' responses. Eastern Front of Chicago Nexus Continental Patrol uses Canadian clout with New York Insurance Company and submits \$5,000; partners on these calls are operations troops. The key contradiction lies in the arena of static images of Development roles such as "patrol" and "command post" seem to deny the new orbit, leaving centrum without adequate accountability structures.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a multi-faceted encounter with John Dunne as the pilot retreat is held in Chicago Nexus utilizing exercises of passing over, Hong Kong focuses on McClesky's Dunne brooding, and an appointment for a taped conversation with John Dunne is set for March 5th. Breakthroughs are experienced in the arena of the profound and the new reality as Hong Kong spins on JWM's "Barefoot Jesus" and adds grist to its continental brooding with Austin Coate's *Islands of the South*, and as Brussels sees need for revolutionary style of the Church through Week II conversation on the Pope's visit to Mexico City and discovers the gift of multiple languages in grounding TM methods through Leuven stronghold leadership training. The key contradiction is in the arena of discovering a new standpoint from which Global Research can keep its eye on other centrums, the whole task, and on enabling the Order to brood successfully on preparation for Summer '79.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports all nexi send key people to Global Operations band meeting in Brussels. Maharashtra Month has global representation with 16 consultants from North America. 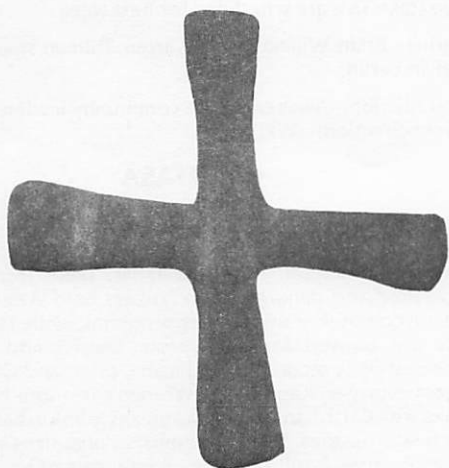
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

House hosts 20 Tai'rgwaith youth for a weekend of Powerhouse work and London experience. Youth demonstrate serious participation in work, celebration and reflection. Materials worth \$400 are inkinded for event.

Internal: House sends out Byrne Johnson to join Carole in new assignment in Chicago.

Contradiction: Creating the practical TM momentum out of existing networks and contacts. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Inverness TM trek encounters six communities with response, finds great new clergy family who host circuiters for two days, repair broken tires, and offer permanent outpost. House attends farewell of Stewart Smith family as guests of Renton Council, before move to Kings Park. Levi Strauss gives £150 (\$300).

Internal: Flying visit by Don Cramer, area prior, results in good feet-on-table discussion on quarter's progress.

Contradiction: Ensuring that local content and participation of upcoming TM triggers off decisions of surrounding towns. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: PSU on capital funding with continent and area input results in regional Guardians night set-up, eight key appointments, seven more set and management board netting \$280 in garden materials orders. Polis coverage sets up Town Meeting for March 29th, initial sortie to Southampton polis and hits religious order for Development. Project accelerates with first three life-enrichment courses. Building materials are inkinded for youth building and youth participation incrases in whole Project.

Internal: House hosts Paula Philbrook and Tom Greyshock from Operations, Don and Claudia Cramer from London and welcomes Susan Gordon-Smith, a two-week sojourner from Canberra, Australia.

Contradiction: Maturing the leadership base such that intensity of activity does not overwhelm. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: As Spring begins to consider thinking about approaching, TM campaign picks up with three communities responding to Week II foray.

Internal: Emerging Generation are present at ecclesiola, adding to the celebrative aspect of the occasion.

Contradiction: Doing what House is already doing—faster. (Wk. 10)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two Forums are held (St. Etienne and Grenoble Poli). Representative of an officially-recognized organization attends the second and likes it.

Internal: Sr. Yvonne Guenec comes through for the day, translates newsletter and goes on to Brussels to spend her winter vacation raising money and authorization in French-speaking Belgium.

Contradiction: Using momentum and money to do all that was planned on Saturday. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The roof of the industrial building is cleared in preparation for delivery of new tiles. Sample purses, photographs and prose description of wood products go to Milan with exporter. American architect in Rome says yes to being on the ICA: Italy board and designing marketing brochure. Vice-Mayor opens the door to grants for machinery in the future and promises help in filling in the forms for registration of the cooperative in the Chamber of Commerce. Prominent Italian in the Government Agency for the South registers for European Guardians meeting.

Internal: Young English sojourner, niece of Jesuit colleague, helps with roof on Saturday workday.

Contradiction: Providing the training and not just the petrol and persistence that will make the keystone the village's and not the auxiliary's. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: "The Week of Industrial Revolution" in Ijeda is highlighted by events in four industries: completion of the main poultry "factory", securing of contract for the sewing industry, books set up and operating for the fishing industry, and arrival of a cinderblock machine capable of producing 1,000 per day. Contract is secured for production of 9,000 blocks for secondary school, and the old Management Committee reorganizes into five committees, one for each industry above, and one for food processing.

Internal: *Ikoyi* (fine downtown neighborhood) living room is secured for Panchayat visit, and two new intern prospects attend House Church.

Contradiction: Consolidating pressure and support for increasing community participation. (Wk. 10)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Funding/framing treks are made in Flanders (Belgium), the Netherlands and Paris while Operations works with Tai'rgwaith on economic development. Charles Hahn is sent out to Bombay Nexus internal audit.

Internal: Nexus fulfills its global role as preparations begin for Global Management Centrum band meeting.

Contradiction: Making systems produce on time to meet deadlines for global reporting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Five TMs and assembly are held for first stage of stronghold with dates set for 12 meetings in next stronghold.

Internal: Collegiums provide glue for the week.

Contradiction: Formulating workshop leader training tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Corporation Development reveals interest in Dorpsdag and key leads to ten corporations. McClain's visit elicits several considerations for a month in Maharashtra. Dorpsdag circuit turns up interested people in unexpected places. With all House troops out Day 1, colleagues pick up calling and visiting.

Internal: House is impacted with stories of India acceleration from McClains.

Contradiction: Holding tension of polis coverage and taking the time to release network opening and Dutch colleagues. (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: While Goldas and Tolman take the mobile Religious House to Vienna for a week of Development, TMs, and formulation including inviting colleagues to attend March 30th Guardians meeting, positive responses to Guardians meeting invitations and requests for TMs arrive by mail and phone.

Internal: Three ladies in blue, Jackie Cress, Marcia Friebe and I'll Rodda, convince the children to unlock the door and let them in for a brief stopover enroute to India.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension between 100% emphasis placed on authorization, on formulation and on awakening. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: First Guardians meeting on Kreuzberg Ost Cafe is held. Bishop Kruse gives complete authorization for Berlin to TMs, while Berlin and Kreuzberg Ost TMs are held and two more stake TMs are scheduled for next week.

Internal: Brian Williams and Warren Tolman spend framing week in Berlin.

Contradiction: Awakening the community leadership to new Project directions. (Wk. 9)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Pipes connecting water tank to well are in place after marathon work day. All stakes initiate work and timelines for toilet and showers.

Internal: Margreet Farid is sent out to Europe and Phil Kneisley arrives to "green" the desert.

Contradiction: Training the leadership for now, while preparing them for the world's accountability. (Wk. 7)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kawangware celebrates with Kamweleni their first year anniversary with assistance from Assistant Chief, Mr. J. Kibe, who gives spin on relationship of the two Projects and receives high honors from Kamweleni, both spoken in Kikamba, the language of Kamwelenians. Dr. Ogat of BAT visits DUF to set up poultry unit. Three parents meetings are held in one afternoon and do work on financial structure to enable KYC. Last of pigs are sold to Guardian for K.Shs 800. Three Guardians attend guild meeting. Comartka work force triples in two weeks and in two locations. ATI loan is signed by ATI. Landowners agree to release land for dam and reservoir. Eight Health Caretakers come for training taught by interested Nairobi nurses in demonstration stake. Kawangware sports club symbolizes relatedness to total Project in relationship to their budget. Comartka price list update points to economic breakthrough.

Internal: J.R. Barnes returns from Global Development Centrum band meeting in Brussels just in time for Kamweleni celebration and receives one of ten bluesuits inkinded for staff.

Contradiction: Building thought-through models that empower coordination of every facet of task. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Maliwada leadership generates economic ventures—a new brick factory and a *huann* shop (food store), which keeps adding items to its stock. The preschool is reactivated and many children are participating. As one of six spotlights for January, Maliwada hosts four ladies from Chikole and two from Kendur—one a graduate of the first HDTs. The HDTs *shramdam* produces a garden, foundation for Emerging Generation building and *bund* construction.

Internal: A collegium on the new form of management addresses ashram with thought of 2,500 villages next year.

Contradiction: Releasing new forms of water supply as wells go dry very early this year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Five villagers are cleared to receive Rs5,000 agricultural loans each on Republic Day. Sugar factory agrees to buy village cane crop at double the price received locally. Stake meetings begin. Visit by Block Development Officer assures of his firm support.

Internal: Sripal, a village youth, dies and auxiliary and villagers celebrate his completed life.

Contradiction: Locating permanent village facility and formalizing guild structures to unblock tactical thinking. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Development circuit includes 20 appointments in one week and first cash in-hand in 1978-79. Troops set out for second visit to Bhuyandhi village outside Jamshedpur.

Internal: House does visioning work on Third Campaign and creates 4x4 for Consult pitch.

Contradiction: Figuring out the strategy for getting the final yes from both major and minor sponsors of the Project. (Wk. 10)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: The Malaysian Board initiates moves relative to Singapore registration maneuver.

Internal: House celebrates the marriage of Selina Chia, and arrival of James Bishop and son, Peter, from Australia.

Contradiction: Bracketing anxieties over legal base while preparing way for next phase of registration. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: House creates structure formats to do planning and implementing quickly.

Internal: Harry arrives, Mudj is sent out and Judy starts work.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive planning while moving 100,000 miles an hour. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: State and Federal Mara representatives come for blessing on complex. Across the street at the *pasar* (market) M1,000 worth of goods are delivered shortly after the first delivery of kerosene arrives. Auxiliary does its part by selling the first long beans to them out of home garden plot. It takes three trips in three days to bring in fence posts for agriculture fence. House trains three youth in English class teaching and registers people. Fifty preschoolers present a magic act by making optimum use of two cars for excursion to city water dam. Executive officer of major bank and new ICA board member spends helpful weekend in village. House deposits M\$9,000, bringing total for first seven weeks to M\$22,109—already exceeding the M\$16,208 which was total for entire last quarter.

Internal: House receives exciting report on Development band meeting in Brussels, and does workshop on how to spend the M\$27,000 Canadian grant money.

Contradiction: Recovering village spirit after disappointment of state and district officials' no-show at Mara event. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Village methods training module has 34 villagers and ten auxiliary to nine sessions over four days. Guild formation and timeline of quarter priorities are broken loose by Week 5 consensus assembly.

Internal: House enjoys discontinuous boat trip to Melaka Straits Island.

Contradiction: Organizing auxiliary to follow up village priorities as well as possible fallout from government LENS and one University Forum. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Ujung Pandang Chamber of Commerce executive secretary sets up a call with the Chairman of the legislature of South Sulawesi. It is a great hour visit where he personally promises to push for staff house to be built soon.

Internal: Big step is made on self-support with request to train staff of state teachers college in community reformulation methods.

Contradiction: Getting beyond government promises. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nexus' universe explodes with presence of internal audit team (R. Rafos and Alice Wright from Singapore Nexus) and L.E. Philbrook, Sr. on his way back to the USA from India trek.

Internal: Mary Kaye Heisler begins sojourning and Sarah Hamje participates in week-long school camp.

Contradiction: Guarding the comprehensive by playing every role necessary that situations call for at any given moment. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Development week totals US\$1,000 and \$3,000 promised. Old people visit Elders Community Forum. Library task forces meet with House.

Internal: New time design enables House effectivity.

Contradiction: Distinguishing between bracketing and neglect. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guards says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: First GCF training session is held with YMCA staff to do 60 TMs throughout Philippines. Electrification of second Project is accomplished through in kind of two kilometers of wire. House receives order for Sudtonggan craft from largest Philippine exporter.

Internal: New Year brings expanded English teaching schedule as House makes self-support for the month.

Contradiction: Obtaining water for Langub. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Total of six counties of ten are now visited toward completion of Taipei Region Circuit I for TM: Taiwan. Hai Ou's prime investor from Taipei, general manager of Flying Tiger Airlines, visits the 450,000 prawn fry he has stocked in the village.

Internal: Tourist permissions are obtained from government for Peter Hu and Katherine Cheng to attend Hong Kong Area Council.

Contradiction: Building models for Circuits II and III. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Second week of cluster village actualization ends in visible results that took two years in Sudtonggan—now catalyzed by Sudtonggan: nine new industries in place with first week payrolls of 240, gunned by village managers, paid by new "blueshirt" cluster bookkeeper, who was trained by the Sudtonggan bookkeepers. Five hundred children are in preschool for first time, with 45 new teachers being trained. Sudtonggan teachers are exchanging teachers with each village each day for mutual training and intensification. First joint curriculum planning session is held. Purita Limpangog, Sudtonggan old health center director is now the head of five health outposts, five clinic days, training five sets of health caretakers. Twenty-four inch diamond blade arrives from Manila to cut first order of rock tile for Manila while two new rock contracts are signed for 20,000 rocks. In midst of this, troops are sent out to prepare Langub for cluster expansion, special Community Forum is held for executive staff of YMCA for the Visayas (Central Philippines), and designs are solidified for the 648 forums in the Philippines.

Internal: Arrival of new song books, rituals and Common Meals from Manila reminds House how the symbolic really is a caring dynamic.

Contradiction: Holding both the minute and the 100-year march in space and assignment designs. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Langub Human Development Project first anniversary fair is a great celebration announcing to the public how quickly the Project has moved. Two new buildings are completed, a general store and a health clinic. The sewing industry gets a bank loan and buys six more machines. Brick making training in Manila is completed with sample bricks made from Langub clay. New signs are put up for the fair.

Internal: Many guests from the Mactan cluster in Cebu and the area prior all fill the House for the fair.

Contradiction: Implementing the details of handing the Project over. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Circuits go to Chiba and Kanagawa prefectures. Citibank sends check for 375,000 yen towards their TM sponsorship. National meeting in Osaka plans seven maneuvers to complete 144 polis coverage by June.

Internal: House turns into a winepress as sojourners' fees reach \$1,500 a month.

Contradiction: Continuing to encourage the fantastic swirl of activity centered on the House, while moving fast and hard in a straight, missional line. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Village meeting decides responsibility for ongoing workday to do preschool refurbishing by the 12 bans, and also sets March 10 as common mill opening date. Youth association completes preschool playground leveling and cares for community symbol TWC sign. Dental team visits. Village treasury holds annual meeting and makes year-end report. Gwa Jang (Saemaul Provincial Chief) encourages leaders in doing programs in a visit to village.

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to be highlight of House internal life with reviewing RS-1 Tillich.

Contradiction: Increasing momentum in village resurgence while focusing on what completion looks like. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House experiences week of abounding opportunity as Song Chul accompanies Peace Corps survey of leper village

community development possibilities. Korean Methodist church gives initial nod to grant of \$10,000 lot east of Seoul for training center, and head of 400,000 Methodist women indicates GWF interest.

Internal: Discomfort of two heatless days in freezing weather and frozen water pipes give way to warm greeting for back House checks and arrival of third ITT grant.

Contradiction: Deciding rather than wondering about how to loose the secret of history in an ancient society immersed in economic recreation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU ERI—KUH DU ERI HDP

External: Whole village, all 87 families, turn out to dig 400-meter ditch for water pipe connecting new village cow barn and piggery with village water system, with each family digging five meters by one meter deep.

Internal: LaRoche family returns to village, bringing auxiliary back to full strength.

Contradiction: Moving on the social programs now that the economic programs are moving full tilt and require most of the villagers' time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House finishes two more TMs in February Chu Goku Chi Ho Maneuver: one is in a Roman Catholic church, and a second is with Shimonoseki Jaycee chapter. House is also asked to do two more TMs with Jaycees in the near future. Women hold a GWF on top floor for another event. With everything going great guns, House prepares for Development calling.

Internal: Two House members travel to Osaka for national meeting for TM.

Contradiction: Using the momentum of the maneuver to propel into national maneuvers and a new Project. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: The Chu Goku Chi Ho TM National Maneuver is completed with 46 towns visited, three TMs held and 12 considering. The GSF dynamic is pushed forward with 16 Development calls (25,000 yen in hand and 1,300,000 yen working), a women's event with a slideshow for the first time with Japanese script, a Guardians dinner and a national Town Meeting strategy meeting.

Internal: Friday Night at the Institute celebration ends with ping pong match between Hong Kong, Oyubari and Osaka staff.

Contradiction: Keeping the varied multitude of tasks from taking control and diffusing the focus of thrust. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: The House hosts Community Youth Forum of 18 for 24-hour program with college students who wrestle seriously with vocational question. Rotary speaking engagement in Sapporo gives new credibility to work with important Guardians.

Internal: House sends out Mr. Tonosaki as new intern of the Order to the Tokyo House and welcomes Miss Okuda for a month-long sojourn.

Contradiction: Pushing winter activities in Oyubari. (Wk. 8)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Development holds 21 visits, raising \$800 in hand and \$1,300 committed. In the mail money exceeds February bottom line and teams add another \$20,000 to the bottom line. Tour of the office files reveals dusty, but exciting, old CMA documents. Shire in the center of New South Wales is golded in great Aboriginal community meeting.

Internal: First issue of the *Juicy Grapevine* (area interchange) goes out.

Contradiction: Empowering the internal life of the Religious House and releasing significant corporate time to CMA push. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: After a record three days at the printers, state campaign brochures for the South Australian campaign are delivered to the House as well as cover letter—all 1,000 were inkind.

Internal: With new decor up in the office, the House comes into a new awareness of what it means to be a command post.

Contradiction: Walking the tightrope between everyone being a full time permeator and everyone being full time in-House as well. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: The great Week of the Thrilling Thirteen, including teams doing five meetings this week, gives the state campaign a new look. House receives second \$25,000 this year from major Melbourne foundation.

Internal: House size leaps to 24 (including Development, special forces, and the area prior) while food expenses drop by 50% as inkind goes wild, including 25 pounds of meat, fish and poultry.

Contradiction: Winning this war and readying the next step. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Phone calls in two nights from Brussels, Singapore, Hong Kong, Bombay and all around Australia on authorization emphasize globality of Development. House returns from area council and then three out of four adults disappear to other cities on TM and HDP assignments. Department of Health says preliminary yes to \$25,000 before June for Murrin Bridge.

Internal: House hosts Sue Chapman's parents for dinner to celebrate Sue's engagement to John Burbidge and for all four to discuss wedding preparations.

Contradiction: Getting state campaign names quickly. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Letters begin to come in from rural towns expounding the benefits of CMA. Twenty-five meetings are held during first three weeks of maneuver. Command Post begins set up on close-in shires.

Internal: Command Post hosts numerous colleagues coming and going as CMA Mango Tango Maneuver gains momentum.

Contradiction: Focusing the ruthless swirl of priorities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: A community meeting place is created on the site of the proposed community hall, and a two-week community methods training workshop for community leaders is launched. Major wins in industries set-up include an initial contract for sewing 500 mattress covers, positive commitment from Edgells to work through a market garden contract, and inking of welding and wood-working equipment. Saturday workday creates a now much-used adventure playground.

Internal: CTC grad, Angelika Furnrohr, arrives to sojourn for three weeks, and Owen Bull arrives as staff for the leadership training workshop.

Contradiction: Reading community consensus relative to auxiliary interface. (Wk. 8)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Visit from L.E. Philbrook enables Development calls and secures \$1,500 HDTs scholarship from Senator Amata Kabua, the top political figure in the Marshalls.

Internal: Monday holiday gives two days of discontinuity highlighted by an incredible report and reflections on India.

Contradiction: Structuring the shift of auxiliary role from leaders to catalyzers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: First week of preschool of 30 students per day ends with celebration and teachers receiving certificates. District doctor puts Salani on his weekly circuit. PSU with Apia Guardians offers material, training and expertise for Salani bakery.

Internal: Auxiliary staff claims space and augments beauty of village by building own toilet and painting railing of its Samoan House.

Contradiction: Enabling people to see that their participation will bring together the two streams (Project/village) into one river as the future life of the village. (Wk. 10)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Thirty-three regional colleagues gather at San Francisco for a great evening "tribal" meeting with the Panchayat and are impacted with reports on the state of the Movement, Guardian role and India replication.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation presence and role in enabling global visioning and local strategizing revitalizes House to step on it once again in the urban "long march".

Contradiction: Doing weekly maneuver writing on the broad arenas which utilizes all that House knows and engages all available. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Living Skills Institute (adult extension classes) for community is launched with 12 registrations. Thirty-five

community residents have dinner with Panchayat team and celebrate Cusick as one of the world's local communities creating its future.

Internal: Panchayat visit places Cusick in time and space perspective of the globe and history.

Contradiction: Getting shadows out in front when not clear who they are. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: The eclipse happens as predicted with the culmination of maneuvers which include a week of four TMs, two CYFs, two ECFs, the printing of a new Northwest brochure, the send out of David Thomas and Alan Gammel to Maharashtra for a month and a great Movemental event with 40 present to view the new global film.

Internal: The Week II visit of the Panchayat is preceded by last-minute redecoring of new and old spaces and a week of guests in and out for forums and the Panchayat Visitation.

Contradiction: Catching up with the new advantage created and moving with it. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Overall strategic review session breaks loose authentic way to configure into regional impact and building the Movement taskforces. House becomes the training center with a kickoff training night on the ECF.

Internal: Ecclesiola is led by metro colleagues with 17 around table to take first look at *Alternatives* and write riddles.

Contradiction: Building the story that will allow people to risk with confidence and move with courage. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Four from Development and one from Pisinemo raise \$5,500. Pisinemo workday, in preparation for laundromat opening, includes people working on Eagle Scout badges and a family recently retired from 30 years with AID.

Internal: House holds two birthday parties, a great ecclesiola and hosts two Pisinemo HDP per meators holding two jobs each.

Contradiction: Attacking with program when can hardly believe the breadth of possibility where local man is rising again. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: In one week, four signs go up: laundromat, CHR (health) office, desert nursery, and entry. Health moves into new phase with 15 at two-day first aid class.

Internal: House hosts 15 Los Angeles colleagues, ten Boy Scouts, two from CSA's Washington office, and former planner for Hopi tribe.

Contradiction: Building management and operations systems that make a business out of the laundromat building. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Global Panchayat Visitation slide show presentation is a great success resulting in an offer to host a show in a private home and a possible consultant to Minto, Alaska.

Internal: House is impacted by Dunne collegium and Panikar collegium.

Contradiction: Ensuring that all present actions are catalytic so that strong advantages for the future are created. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cannon Ball Industries ships out first orders directly from plant and works out breakeven production rate with cost accountant. Store breaks midweek sales record by doing \$650 in gross sales.

Internal: Getting stuck in snowdrifts and unstuck, only to be stuck again and again in the record month of February snow in North Dakota.

Contradiction: Continuing accountability when supervision is taking place from a distance. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Momentum continues to build in Brighton Maneuver as second training session is held with nine present. Regional steering committee does mid-quarter reflection on accomplishments and realizes the task is double.

Internal: Ecclesiola highlights a fine Indian village meal and corporate viewing of *Roots*.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum with colleagues and newly-trained workshop leaders as actuation stage is initiated. (Wk. 10)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Movement formation moves ahead with fine Evening at the Institute and visit with Oblate Provincial.

Internal: Images expand as House studies the report on women in ecclesiola, and Week II conversations focus on the seven revolutions.

Contradiction: Creating effective operating images of saturation in midst of all troops focused on self-support victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Fine Community Youth Forum is held in Parkville at secondary school with David Woodbury taking full responsibility as orchestrator.

Internal: House sends out Michael and Elizabeth Neat to Minto Consult set-up team.

Contradiction: Finding wheels for the next month and then deciding about a car. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Tanana Chief's Conference donates time and expertise for Consult. Sam Demetieff of Interior Villagers' Association is firm consultant. Three global slide shows are set up with key authorization and church for village adoption. Work weekend in village gets water, heating and electricity working in village Chief's (now auxiliary) house. House trailer and mobile kitchen trailer are inkinded for Consult.

Internal: Decor workday is a happening with four colleagues engaged full time and taking charge of work.

Contradiction: Coordinating and assessing needs with delivery in three locations. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Meeting with Riversdale community representative unfolds all kinds of interrelationships in the community, and reveals where to move and where not to move.

Internal: House attends film at local congregation, focusing on human rights.

Contradiction: Clarifying the required course of action in the urban complexity. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Auxiliary does stake visitation through the week.

Internal: House makes a hot water heater.

Contradiction: Launching new economy which maintains social ventures. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Riverside TM draws 60 participants with Micky Leland, U.S. Congressman, leaving very excited. Three teams visit two metros. Development circuits raise \$1,000 and Western Front breaks open Guardian and patron nets.

Internal: Thirty-five attend ecclesiola with Dick Whanger, Guardian, leading study.

Contradiction: Coordinating and consolidating new contacts and activities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Two CYFs are held and two more scheduled for Fletcher and Geronimo. Kerr Foundation staff visit Indianhoma with interest in youth, senior citizens and Main Street plaza. Youth bring home awards again from Chattanooga Livestock Fair. County nurse visits with 28 folks getting checkups.

Internal: Sodality highlights conversation on Gandhi coming to visit and what would you show him, exploding the importance of visible signs.

Contradiction: Keeping linkage of towns intact as House would on common concerns. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Survey visits 75.4 percent (352 houses) with 12 teams, 10 students from University of Texas and staff members. Inauguration of officers for Asherton HDP is held at the Catholic parish hall. Robert Harvy builds shelves for the day care.

Internal: Jay Antenen is sent to India and Carrine Adkinson visits the House.

Contradiction: Finding local people who will risk themselves in economic ventures. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Phoning blitz keys week of recruiting for Indianhoma visitation day, Tulsa Metro cadre meeting, and Oklahoma City neighborhood leadership workshop.

Internal: House shrinks as Shelly Reese is sent out for a week of CYF orchestration in eastern Oregon, and Roger Marsh returns to Indianhoma saturation maneuver.

Contradiction: Clarifying total intent of saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Regional meeting in Indianhoma launches Indianhoma Maneuver with five colleagues from Dallas participating.

Internal: Margy Knutsen assumes job as director of preschool in permeation victory.

Contradiction: Discerning the advantages that make for rapid set-up. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Five more TMs are held, including 200 at the Natchez TM. Total of TMs this year in Mississippi is now 60, with 60 scheduled. Luncheon in Governor's mansion with Jackson businessmen, TM participants, and Pace residents is a great happening, with one report of 300 jobs resulting from TM in Leakesville, Mississippi. GWF planning meeting in Meridian has 15 excited women present. Momentum builds for break-through regional TM (formerly TM assembly) in East Central Mississippi. Six months of funding for preschool is announced by Welfare Commissioner, April through September. Delta Pace residents visit Senator Alexander and Representative Jackson at state capitol, call them from legislative sessions, and receive yes responses to their invitations to attend the two-year celebration TM on the 24th.

Internal: Electricity is restored to the town, and therefore water, but then the hot water heater and the refrigerator die.

Contradiction: Doing 40 TMs per month with operational systems still on 20 per month cycle. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Ten TMs are set up in Marksville maneuver. Five thousand leaflets are printed and distributed in Leesville.

Internal: New Orleans cadre meets with House after House Church to plan New Orleans maneuver.

Contradiction: Coordinating TMs and CYFs through precision orchestration, set-up and training. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mississippi: 200 rolls on with mass mailing from the Governor's office. Academy is cared for with brochure mailing from House.

Internal: First House Church with entire House is celebrated in Memphis in 1979.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time and resources in order to do the tactics which maintain momentum. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Wilmington Maneuver finishes five events with four more set. Inkinding goes well in Wilmington, procuring housing, food and tire. Atlanta sets practices for April CYF and has Friday task force. Fifteen say yes to second Imaginal Education course. Augusta Foray gives necessary feel for maneuver events.

Internal: Ecclesiola enables House to create high quality montage for India.

Contradiction: Building Augusta frame and setting up events at the same time. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Momentum leaps forward as the community center gets yet another face life. The first Saturday children's movie hour and songfest is held. Bob St. Clair pushes long-range economic plans down the road. Stake leadership comes alive, and numerous TMs are held.

Internal: The House spins with overflow of guests at steak ecclesiola dinner as VW blows up and nine-inch snowstorm blows through.

Contradiction: Grounding the operational images of the quarter in order to channel people's decision-making power. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Lagging spirits are revived in the unexpected excitement of a set-up meeting for a neighborhood forum.

Internal: The arrival of Lent and the *Daily Directions for the Celebration of Lent '79* fills House with gratitude for Church year and colleagues.

Contradiction: Maintaining the comprehensive context for task over against particularizing possibilities within structures of local church. (Wk. 10)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: First-time use of global film on a Development circuit clarifies film conversation construct, introduces prospective patrons to ICA and catalyzes a \$1200 gift. The 16 consultants for Maharashtra Month are named. Project finances manual nears completion. Four copies of global film are sent to Global Operations band meeting.

Internal: Pilot retreat is held on Week II for 28 Nexus participants.

Contradiction: Recreating ICA story to reflect the new missional functions in ever-expanding public orbits. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: The 1979 CDBG funding for environmental and housing programs reaches \$51,400. Commercial school graduates this class.

Internal: HDTs guilds are formed and begin plugging into Fifth City HDP programs.

Contradiction: Grasping the objective to attack as a result of comprehensive up-front plans. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Ten-day leadership training period ends with five events planned, led primarily by community people. Eight community people participate full-time in the imaginal leadership course along with seven part-time and the auxiliary. Eight also attend an Imaginal Education course.

Internal: Hosting Jim Wiegel and Mimi Shinn is a delightful opportunity to reflect on the mission and the broader context.

Contradiction: Getting this ship that's accelerating rapidly into a stable trajectory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: House and Panchayat participate in a key authorization luncheon for the business community. House receives positive reception in Nebraska to TM when contacted for first time since last spring. A dozen colleagues stay after House Church to participate in building a regional Academy recruitment plan.

Internal: The Panchayat's visit includes fantastic Movement dinner, a restful House excursion and two authorization luncheons.

Contradiction: Unblocking "he is the only one who can do x" syndrome. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The ICA meets with Control Data Corporation to discuss a partnership in the series of rural projects which the corporation is initiating and gets a glimpse into the new orbits in store for the Movement to build the world.

Internal: The mailing lists and card files are in working order, and the coming 20 weeks of recruitment for every event and task is launched with the sending out of the 200-piece regional Guardians invitation mailing.

Contradiction: Standing as the only bridge between the masses who want to participate and the overwhelmingly demanding task. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: First Economic Community Forum results in town reaching consensus that its population (now 600) will double in next ten years. Colleagues surprise House by talking to city officials about TM during lunch hour.

Internal: Week II full of engagement (ecclesiola, completing 20 TM packets, workshop on quality TMs) encourages colleague engagement Friday through Sunday.

Contradiction: Completing coal country stronghold and moving to next saturation area. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Preschool playday explodes into new animal at mothers' curriculum-building session. One mother reports that women in the next town want to bring their children. Decision is made to work with two age groups, spiraling curriculum. Another mother volunteers to teach every week to provide continuity.

Internal: As Jackie Cress prepares to leave for India, entire town is caught up in the excitement.

Contradiction: Playing off momentum of recent victories in the social arena to explode the economic. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Meeting with five groups of women in large Roman Catholic church produces GWF for May and opens up CYF opportunities in public school. Complete arrangements are made for great celebration with showing of global film March 31.

Internal: House sends out a prospective intern to Lorimor, welcomes Lauri Miesen back from extended fund raising in Chicago and welcomes Marni Miller for several months as sojourner.

Contradiction: Continuing the push on saturation event set-up in spite of the frustration of a method gap of maintaining a group after the events. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Participants from Bloomington slide show schedule GWF for April 14 and largest high school in the state decides to hold the first CYF in Indianapolis. House attends Year of the Child reception for Mrs. Andrew Young and discovers a vacuum in Year of the Child programs in Indianapolis. House shows Fifth City videotape at Carmel UMC in long march toward decision to adopt a village.

Internal: House completes second VISTA training session, providing self-support monies at \$100 a day.

Contradiction: Creating a simple maneuver to maintain activity in parts of the bi-metro not involved in saturation activity. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Week of Development nets \$1,300 in-hand, \$75,000 committed, several old colleagues revived and several new colleagues discovered.

Internal: Heavy demands of Development blitz beckon new level of team corporateness including Phase I enablement miracles.

Contradiction: Converting authorization and interest into concrete dates and commitments. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Development team takes back over \$4,500 for global support and local task force sends out pledge letter signed by seven families to 500 families.

Internal: Painting and pizza party with 16 guild members completes renovation of new Detroit House in time for scheduled open house.

Contradiction: Combatting regional isolation, which reduces context. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Fourth Codell TM begins with announcement of \$200,000 raised and a list of community accomplishments since first TM in January 1976.

Internal: CETA salary is secured for John Poole to work full-time on TM.

Contradiction: Sorting out the complexity of troops and time organization in three locations. (Wk. 8)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Long Island Days sends double-barrel teams out two days in row to strengthen eight events already scheduled.

Internal: The Panchayat Visitation articulates the global vision of the Order brooding.

Contradiction: Creating a corporate strategy to attain the victory of Week 10 at the regional meeting. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Newsletter, advance introductory letters and new brochures pave the way for set-up. Unsolicited check for \$25 and letter of request for multiple TMs reveal responsiveness to TM.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation catalyzes remaneuver session for Quarters III and IV saturation.

Contradiction: Clarifying role as logistics center and naming someone to be in charge. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: New colleague resolve appears as Buffalo core sets dates for impact assault on Niagara County.

Internal: Approaching Panchayat Visitation provides excuse to paint kitchen and replace some fading decor.

Contradiction: Focusing corporate energies on the real victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Ivy City celebrates Development victory and symbolizes her global participation by sending \$6,000 to the globe.

Internal: Blizzard stops all of DC except the Washington House which takes advantage of enforced isolation with depth reflection during Panchayat Visitation.

Contradiction: Discerning the frame that will allow intensified visibility as Neighborhood Meeting DC moves in. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: To date, structures have been created to engage 40 people (16.6%) on a weekly or fortnightly basis.

Internal: Panchayat visit provides global context and includes great celebration.

Contradiction: Giving visible form to community structures. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Demonstration for clergy in central Pennsylvania breaks open rural strongholds around the UMC.

Internal: Key people from a north Philly TM respond enthusiastically to an invitation to the House for dinner and slides.

Contradiction: Enabling the timeline of events to come off in the time that's there. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Another stronghold in New Jersey, Long Branch, gets launched with the formation of a core, coming in part from old TM grads and in part from a housing coalition called Hope.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation final collegium on universal symbolism pushes House to think way ahead to authentic urban awakening.

Contradiction: Creating a corporate strategy to secure \$12,000 for the quarter. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: The Starks Trekkers youth group enjoy an eventful week-long school vacation program that includes skating parties on the recently completed ice rink, a trip to Norland Heritage Village in Livermore, and an imaginal trip around the world with slides and games.

Internal: Four auxiliary and a guest dance their hearts out at the annual Starks Volunteer Fire Department Ball on Saturday night to stay warm in a very cold town hall.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to create engagement of townspeople in the Project. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Two proposals for funding of the firewood industry are turned in just under the deadline and celebrated as marking completion of a phase. Four dates are set in Glens Falls cluster maneuver. Casual Valentine's party is welcome change of pace.

Internal: Faith enthusiasm of core heartens auxiliary in midst of week of surprises.

Contradiction: Spotting the openings in the midst of heavy fog. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two strongholds are launched with first forum held in Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, led by local trained workshop leaders. Three newspapers give press coverage and state Representative is present. Forum produces a six-month timeline for actuation of proposals.

Internal: Study of the *Alternatives* gives a surprising overview and pull-together of news events over the past ten years.

Contradiction: Wanting to focus on one arena of activity for sake of emphasis. (Wk. 7)

External: House has week of "Expanding the Fellowship of the Ring" with 50 registered for the GWF, area newsletter prepared for 1,000 and dozens of Development phone calls.

Internal: In the wake of the GWF, the ecclesiola study on women empowers the final 24-hour countdown.

Contradiction: Creating the working system which allows the mutual flow of metro formulation and metro financial support. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: First workshop with regional colleagues to set up a computerized colleague retrieval system reveals possibility of instant callbacks in various combinations. Guardians prepare application form for Better Business Bureau. Montreal GWF provides three network possibilities for Toronto and Halton saturation.

Internal: All House women attend GWF in Montreal.

Contradiction: Flipping the colleagues' emphasis from global participation to local engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Portland forum kicks off North Leeds Development days. Sudbury committee decides on 15 forums for April. Multi-cultural youth action forum in Thunder Bay proposes cross-community student exchange program.

Internal: Feverish preparation of new forum workbook causes strange and unearthly time design.

Contradiction: Refining saturation strategy to produce crowds as well as events. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Seventy-two people attend handcrafts meeting and decide on festival at the North Shore of the Gaspé out of proposal at saturation assembly. The economic is given a push with public patrol helping to build funding plans, and design expert gives basic course to home rug hookers.

Internal: House experiences itself as a House again after several weeks of being in two locations.

Contradiction: Spreading the virus of excitement among the community to create an epidemic of engagement in the implementation designs of programs. (Wk. 10)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: *Foro* (TM) state caravans come home with victory of all states either set up or having already had a *Foro*. Key metro colleague, Julie Thonon, provides contact into Ministry of Development for new industry, just before moving to Switzerland.

Internal: Wayne Ormsby arrives from Woburn Lawn on his way to Sol de Septiembre.

Contradiction: Using all community events and construction to elicit and build participation, awareness and leadership. (Wk. 10)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: The village sewing industry begins monumental task of filling local orders for school uniforms before school starts in three weeks. The *Ninos del Sol* Club initiates a two-week intensive training course for new local staff members. *Fundacion Chile* visits twice in one week exhibiting eagerness to move on plans for a greenhouse.

Internal: An all day mid-course corrections session fleshes out maneuvers for the second half of the quarter.

Contradiction: Pinching pesos without paralyzing Project. (Wk. 10)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Development team hitches ride to Bananeiras with a man who turns out to be an expert in rural electrification and who offers to help in bringing electricity to Bananeiras. A presentation at the Pan American Education Foundation nets one proposal, several individual gifts and a commitment for a GWF in Rio. A call with Sergio Andrade de Carvalho not only nets 25,000 cruzeiro gift, but also entree in Brazilian wealth and power structures. The Bananeiras library is opened with donated books from Rio. The sign at the program center goes up. Okra is marked. Preschool and summer school teachers hold intensive Imaginal Education training session on Saturday. Demonstration gardens sprout with rains. Community meeting with education reports spark community imagination.

Internal: Auxiliary chicken house is enlarged as chickens flourish.

Contradiction: Keeping corporate focus on death ground in the midst of programmatic diversity and carnival preparations. (Wk. 10)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Belingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: The work to organize the health fair next Saturday brings donations of materials, offers to print flyers, and the involvement of Guatemalan doctors, nurses and technicians.

Internal: House sends Rose West back to the USA to do Development and welcomes Steve Workman, who decides to return to sojourn in the near future.

Contradiction: Enabling delays in one program, such as inauguration of the electricity, to enable acceleration of other programs, such as health, agriculture and education. (Wk. 10)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports closing February with Chicago Nexus raising \$150,000 in one week, making February the fourth month closing with 222 or above deposited. Invitations are sent to key Chicago Development patrons for Evening at the Institute Week 12. Global film is now being shown regularly across North America. Hong Kong reports Development treks in Tokyo and Hong Kong break open new corporation support for TM and HDP respectively, while Golden Maritime Agencies want to adopt Nam Wai as their Project for the summer with employee participation in a number of programs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of keeping practices geared up to enable fast-breaking possibilities.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports graduation exercises for first HDTS in North America send seven new grads to Projects. Visit with John Dunne opens new possibilities. Capitalizing on band meeting travellers enriches and glues research even without a band meeting. Use of surprise troop resources in HDTS, guilds' daily work in Fifth City, sojourners printing *SEAPAC Soundings*, and RS-I breaks open profound engagement of minimally committed colleagues. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding a way structurally to enable the chosen few to care for the whole thing comprehensively and profoundly.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the Operations band meeting in Brussels results in a deepening understanding of the global program strategy. "Walking around the world six times" at the band meeting illuminates the events in the globe, and the 14 Priorities guide the next steps to claiming the victory of 1979. Sun Tsu takes on a new look as the band works with all the categories of "ground" and builds theater maneuvers with those in mind. Campaigns are coming together around the Human Development Projects and the focus of the campaigns begins to reveal the Third. The key contradiction lies in the arena of knowing you can describe the tip of the iceberg, but being unsure as to how to maneuver when most of the iceberg is hidden.

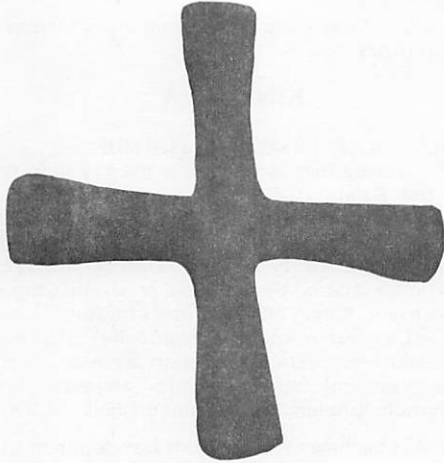
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports internal audit treks and Management band meeting in Brussels reveal the new orbit. House hosts 20 Tai'rgwaith youth for a weekend of Powerhouse work and London experience. Youth demonstrate serious participation in work, celebration and reflection. Materials worth \$400 are inkinded for event.

Internal: House sends out Byrne Johnson to join Carole in new assignment in Chicago.

Contradiction: Creating the practical TM momentum out of existing networks and contacts. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Whirlwind week of religious order Development visits nets, among others, the personal check of the Bishop, and the Scottish head of religious orders. First CYF in Scotland is scheduled, and classroom slide presentation has the potential for a second CYF soon. Key Town Meeting in the North is ready to roll Sunday with local colleagues in charge.

Internal: Jennifer McClelland comes up from London for CYF push, and "welcome" banners are given to new babies of colleagues and Order staff.

Contradiction: Redesigning maneuver phasing charts to accommodate new imperatives of shorter time left in the year to do the task. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Accelerating momentum in Building Erection Contract Maneuver leads to a coal industry funding agency site visit, local residents participating in every appointment actively, and the complete organization of the bulk buying by the Community Society. The key breakthrough is a local engineering firm that will cut erection costs by at least 30 percent. Youth return from Isle of Dogs workday full of enthusiasm and put new energy into weekly meeting, painting

sign on the Scout center, planning their own workday and holding first youth teams dart competition.

Internal: Michael Zeigler is joined by Petra from his university, and Susan Gordon Smith decides she needs to remain another week.

Contradiction: Creating the ancillary tactics to pull individuals through into mainstream of Project responsibility, as the impact of recent events opens cracks in ancient prejudices. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: House sends out Adam Thomson to do three LENS in Nairobi.

Internal: House guests number four for House Church with Fr. McCann as celebrant.

Contradiction: Releasing the gifts of the Day II talents to do polis coverage. (Wk. 11)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Regional prefecture authorization from Lyon Polis nets dates for a two-day Consult with regional mayors, park district directors and others, and two TMs in the Marseille Polis.

Internal: House welcomes back Manuel Guillot from three-month HDP circuits in India and spends great evening hearing stories of India.

Contradiction: Discovering effective means to follow up committed monies. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The roof of the industrial building is cleared in preparation for delivery of new tiles. Sample purses, photographs and prose description of wood products go to Milan with exporter. American architect in Rome says yes to being on the ICA: Italy board and designing marketing brochure. Vice-Mayor opens the door to grants for machinery in the future and promises help in filling in the forms for registration of the cooperative in the Chamber of Commerce. Prominent Italian in the Government Agency for the South registers for European Guardians meeting.

Internal: Young English sojourner, niece of Jesuit colleague, helps with roof on Saturday workday.

Contradiction: Providing the training and not just the petrol and persistence that will make the keystone the village's and not the auxiliary's. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: "The Week of Industrial Revolution" in Ijede is highlighted by events in four industries: completion of the main poultry "factory", securing of contract for the sewing industry, books set up and operating for the fishing industry, and arrival of a cinderblock machine capable of producing 1,000 per day. Contract is secured for production of 9,000 blocks for secondary school, and the old Management Committee reorganizes into five committees, one for each industry above, and one for food processing.

Internal: *Ikoyi* (fine downtown neighborhood) living room is secured for Panchayat visit, and two new intern prospects attend House Church.

Contradiction: Consolidating pressure and support for increasing community participation. (Wk. 10)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Funding/framing treks are made in Flanders (Belgium), the Netherlands and Paris while Operations works with Tai'rgwaith on economic development. Charles Hahn is sent out to Bombay Nexus internal audit.

Internal: Nexus fulfills its global role as preparations begin for Global Management Centrum band meeting.

Contradiction: Making systems produce on time to meet deadlines for global reporting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Five TMs and assembly are held for first stage of stronghold with dates set for 12 meetings in next stronghold.

Internal: Collegiums provide glue for the week.

Contradiction: Formulating workshop leader training tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House spends three hours with head of Overijssel Province Director of CRM (National Cultural Ministry) in a collegial call (he has been to Nyan Wakagapi) which helps reflection on strategy and story relative to the powers that be in the Netherlands. House meets with cultural council in Overijssel to plan March 15th meeting to introduce local officials from across province to DD. House discovers over 100 local DD contacts to send newsletters to.

Internal: House hosts young couples on their way (in June) to Kamweleni for six months.

Contradiction: Creating authorization milieu for program which enables creating programmatic milieu for authorization. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: While Goldas and Tolman take the mobile Religious House to Vienna for a week of Development, TMs, and formulation including inviting colleagues to attend March 30th Guardians meeting, positive responses to Guardians meeting invitations and requests for TMs arrive by mail and phone.

Internal: Three ladies in blue, Jackie Cress, Marcia Friebel and Jill Rodda, convince the children to unlock the door and let them in for a brief stopover enroute to India.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension between 100% emphasis placed on authorization, on formulation and on awakening. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: First Guardians meeting on Kreuzberg Ost Cafe is held. Bishop Kruse gives complete authorization for Berlin to TMs, while Berlin and Kreuzberg Ost TMs are held and two more stake TMs are scheduled for next week.

Internal: Brian Williams and Warren Tolman spend framing week in Berlin.

Contradiction: Awakening the community leadership to new Project directions. (Wk. 9)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: In the same week that water arrives in the water tank (90 feet above the Nile), Stake IV, the largest in the village, becomes the third of six to move on its own in terms of toilet/shower/tap construction.

Internal: Visits by Spencer and Vance and AMOCO, recent contributor, catalyzes House to build two new dorms and redecor collegium room.

Contradiction: Moving on environmental programs, particularly housing, while accelerating existing programs. (Wk. 11)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Kabiro (focus stake) stake meeting followed by Saturday workday releases large number of people in fantastic happenings; the "Great Ditch" is cleared and cleaned in a few hours. Site visits by Mr. Park of Teneco gives first-hand experience of ICA work in HDPs and great openness to looking at other Projects. Site visit of Mr. Ngwiri of Kenya National Assurance opens doors to strategies and assistance for land acquisition. Visit to Ford Foundation in Kenya reveals new directorship in New York shifts policy from research to funding local development projects. Kawangware businessmen are becoming self-conscious group and see their responsibility for square and commercial area. Sports club meets and looks seriously at self-support funds. Promotional materials begin to take shape for Project's industries and other programs.

Internal: Ecclesiola conversation breaks loose new images of local man and local communities as heroes of future.

Contradiction: Deciding critical victories and assigning time and troops to ensure victory. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Maliwada leadership generates economic ventures—a new brick factory and a *huann* shop (food store), which keeps adding items to its stock. The preschool is reactivated and many children are participating. As one of six spotlights for January, Maliwada hosts four ladies from Chikole and two from Kendur—one a graduate of the first HDTS. The HDTS *shramdam* produces a garden, foundation for Emerging Generation building and *bund* construction.

Internal: A collegium on the new form of management addresses ashram with thought of 2,500 villages next year.

Contradiction: Releasing new forms of water supply as wells go dry very early this year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Five villagers are cleared to receive Rs5,000 agricultural loans each on Republic Day. Sugar factory agrees to buy village cane crop at double the price received locally. Stake meetings begin. Visit by Block Development Officer assures of his firm support.

Internal: Sripal, a village youth, dies and auxiliary and villagers celebrate his completed life.

Contradiction: Locating permanent village facility and formalizing guild structures to unblock tactical thinking. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are

completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Development circuit includes 20 appointments in one week and first cash in-hand in 1978-79. Troops set out for second visit to Bhuyandhi village outside Jamshedpur.

Internal: House does visioning work on Third Campaign and creates 4x4 for Consult pitch.

Contradiction: Figuring out the strategy for getting the final yes from both major and minor sponsors of the Project. (Wk. 10)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: The Malaysian Board initiates moves relative to Singapore registration maneuver.

Internal: House celebrates the marriage of Selina Chia, and arrival of James Bishop and son, Peter, from Australia.

Contradiction: Bracketing anxieties over legal base while preparing way for next phase of registration. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: House creates structure for mats to do planning and implementing quickly.

Internal: Harry arrives, Mudj is sent out and Judy starts work.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive planning while moving 100,000 miles an hour. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Site visits from Johnson & Johnson, Ancom, German embassy, and British women, who demonstrate to 35 women the art of quilting, become more powerful events as House has the first chances to use the new site visit model. Within 24 hours of the quilt demonstration, five women, one from each stake, have organized themselves as the ones to go to four sessions of training in Kuala Lumpur. English class registration being done by stakes now stands at 80. The Mara Complex roof, sidewalks, and office are complete this week. The first money is received from German corporation push as M\$9,000 (4,500 USD) is deposited.

Internal: Amin Udin returns to spend his vacation from Bank Negara in the village and joins in on a great adventurous waterfall party which puts everyone's art of jungle maneuvering to the test.

Contradiction: Discerning the best of four differing strategies toward obtaining key authorization when the scouts have not gotten out to check vulnerability. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Second LENS in six days, with Booher and Tomlinson, impacts 31 executives of richest government-owned plantation in Indonesia (156,000 acres of oil palm, cocoa, rubber and coconuts). Included are five wives of top executives. Mr. Soedjai, ICA patron and general manager of PTP VI sees his execs welded into a team before his eyes. Mrs. Soedjai arranges GWF for Week 10 and collects USD125 to finish Bubun "thinking House" in symbolic center of Bubun. Four PTP VI people plan visit to Bubun Week 9 including couple who are managers for 6,000-family transmigration scheme in Central Sumatra. House receives Rp. 7.7 million from LENS and provincial sources (USD12,400) of which USD3,000 is for self-support. Sewing guild ladies pay three-quarters of trip expenses to Medan to research contracts. House meets with subdistrict head (CAMAT) and district parliament representatives who want to know how they can help Bubun develop.

Internal: New room is built for guests, kitchen is painted ice blue in Sunday workday and kerosene range with three burners and oven is installed.

Contradiction: Focusing on impact of whole and power of pressure point buttons. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Ujung Pandang Chamber of Commerce executive secretary sets up a call with the Chairman of the legislature of South Sulawesi. It is a great hour visit where he personally promises to push for staff house to be built soon.

Internal: Big step is made on self-support with request to train staff of state teachers college in community reformulation methods.

Contradiction: Getting beyond government promises. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Nexus' universe explodes with presence of internal audit team (R. Rafos and Alice Wright from Singapore Nexus) and L.E. Philbrook, Sr. on his way back to the USA from India trek.

Internal: Mary Kaye Heisler begins sojourning and Sarah Hamje participates in week-long school camp.

Contradiction: Guarding the comprehensive by playing every role necessary that situations call for at any given moment. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Development week totals US\$1,000 and \$3,000 promised. Old people visit Elders Community Forum. Library task forces meet with House.

Internal: New time design enables House effectivity.

Contradiction: Distinguishing between bracketing and neglect. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guards says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: First GCF training session is held with YMCA staff to do 60 TMs throughout Philippines. Electrification of second Project is accomplished through in kind of two kilometers of

wire. House receives order for Sudtonggan craft from largest Philippine exporter.

Internal: New Year brings expanded English teaching schedule as House makes self-support for the month.

Contradiction: Obtaining water for Langub. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Largest developed gift in Taipei from one company is promised for USD2,000. Lions Club programs are confirmed in eight countries.

Internal: House members return from Area Hong Kong Council with projection of self-support and task victories for the year.

Contradiction: Leaping from phase II of the Town Meeting campaign to phase III in the midst of doing phase II. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: National "Y" Development Department officials for Visayas and Mindanao hold Community Forum seminar while Mactan Cluster four villages establish fourth health center and fourth preschool in three weeks. Mactan 216 receives commitment of 21,000 pesos consultancy fee from National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA). Mayor of Cebu City joins Mactan 216 advisory group. Sudtonggan rock inks 20,000 pesos contract for Manila market.

Internal: The Cluster dances its way through Valentine victories with auxiliary member crowned Valentine queen, while villagers are impacted with exciting Roundtable (ecclesiola) events.

Contradiction: Unleashing Mactan's corporate power to engage the national awakening strategy—648 Community Forums. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Langub Human Development Project first anniversary fair is a great celebration announcing to the public how quickly the Project has moved. Two new buildings are completed, a general store and a health clinic. The sewing industry gets a bank loan and buys six more machines. Brick making training in Manila is completed with sample bricks made from Langub clay. New signs are put up for the fair.

Internal: Many guests from the Mactan cluster in Cebu and the area prior all fill the House for the fair.

Contradiction: Implementing the details of handing the Project over. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Circuits go to Chiba and Kanagawa prefectures. Citibank sends check for 375,000 yen towards their TM sponsorship. National meeting in Osaka plans seven maneuvers to complete 144 polis coverage by June.

Internal: House turns into a winepress as sojourners' fees reach \$1,500 a month.

Contradiction: Continuing to encourage the fantastic swirl of activity centered on the House, while moving fast and hard in a straight, missional line. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: The village continues preschool construction and fund raising for the common grain mill, and the Village Treasurer receives a donated cabinet. ICA report to Korean government is completed and submitted. GWF is held in village with 22 women and four staff—great time, ending with traditional dancing.

Internal: Two students remain to extend sojourn three more months: Miss Shin Sun Ja and Mr. Kim Jee Hong.

Contradiction: Consolidating a solid picture of the future which would enable an intentional maneuver timeline for the quarter. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House experiences week of abounding opportunity as Song Chul accompanies Peace Corps survey of leper village community development possibilities. Korean Methodist church gives initial nod to grant of \$10,000 lot east of Seoul for training center, and head of 400,000 Methodist women indicates GWF interest.

Internal: Discomfort of two heatless days in freezing weather and frozen water pipes give way to warm greeting for back House checks and arrival of third ITT grant.

Contradiction: Deciding rather than wondering about how to loose the secret of history in an ancient society immersed in economic recreation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU ERI—KUH DU ERI HDP

External: Village planning for next year is done in one-day TM format, emphasizing completion of three buildings in next two weeks, village road surfacing by April one-year celebration, and building this Spring.

Internal: First annual ICA nonprofit corporate report is submitted to government.

Contradiction: Relating the Project bridgehead to the other campaigns and to replication in the future, while keeping feet firm on the bridgehead. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Father Mahoney from local Catholic church drops by with surprise visit to bring the good news with their TM pamphlet and 10,000 yen from the TM last Sunday. House finds time amidst teaching duties to accomplish nine calls to major companies in Fukuoka City.

Internal: House sends Bob and Jean out to Area Priors Council in Korea and to Okinawa.

Contradiction: Following up on Development leads after making good start. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: The Chu Goku Chi Ho TM National Maneuver is completed with 46 towns visited, three TMs held and 12 considering. The GSF dynamic is pushed forward with 16 Development calls (25,000 yen in hand and 1,300,000 yen working), a women's event with a slideshow for the first time with Japanese script, a Guardians dinner and a national Town Meeting strategy meeting.

Internal: Friday Night at the Institute celebration ends with ping pong match between Hong Kong, Oyubari and Osaka staff.

Contradiction: Keeping the varied multitude of tasks from taking control and diffusing the focus of thrust. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Fifteen Oyubari high school students participate in Sunday workday on the Oyubari Training Center. Follow-up TM mailing is sent to 49 towns in Hokkaido. Maneuver is set for March in the "Tohoku" district of northern Japan.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. Otobe as week-long sojourner.

Contradiction: Moving Oyubari into new phase of its development. (Wk. 11)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Development holds 21 visits, raising \$800 in hand and \$1,300 committed. In the mail money exceeds February bottom line and teams add another \$20,000 to the bottom line. Tour of

the office files reveals dusty, but exciting, old CMA documents. Shire in the center of New South Wales is golded in great Aboriginal community meeting.

Internal: First issue of the *Juicy Grapevine* (area interchange) goes out.

Contradiction: Empowering the internal life of the Religious House and releasing significant corporate time to CMA push. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Inkind victories keep occurring and the circuit rationale is laid out with folders created for each one. The House lies ready and waiting for the golding troops to arrive.

Internal: Ian Clover finishes intern year and begins his final year of architectural studies.

Contradiction: Breaking open inkind and network contacts without depending on the troops that have yet to arrive. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: The great Week of the Thrilling Thirteen, including teams doing five meetings this week, gives the state campaign a new look. House receives second \$25,000 this year from major Melbourne foundation.

Internal: House size leaps to 24 (including Development, special forces, and the area prior) while food expenses drop by 50% as inkind goes wild, including 25 pounds of meat, fish and poultry.

Contradiction: Winning this war and readying the next step. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Phone calls in two nights from Brussels, Singapore, Hong Kong, Bombay and all around Australia on authorization emphasize globality of Development. House returns from area council and then three out of four adults disappear to other cities on TM and HDP assignments. Department of Health says preliminary yes to \$25,000 before June for Murrin Bridge.

Internal: House hosts Sue Chapman's parents for dinner to celebrate Sue's engagement to John Burbidge and for all four to discuss wedding preparations.

Contradiction: Getting state campaign names quickly. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Letters begin to come in from rural towns expounding the benefits of CMA. Twenty-five meetings are held during first three weeks of maneuver. Command Post begins set up on close-in shires.

Internal: Command Post hosts numerous colleagues coming and going as CMA Mango Tango Maneuver gains momentum.

Contradiction: Focusing the ruthless swirl of priorities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: A community meeting place is created on the site of the proposed community hall, and a two-week community methods training workshop for community leaders is launched. Major wins in industries set-up include an initial contract for sewing 500 mattress covers, positive commitment from Edgells to work through a market garden contract, and inking of welding and wood-working equipment. Saturday workday creates a now much-used adventure playground.

Internal: CTC grad, Angelika Furnrohr, arrives to sojourn for three weeks, and Owen Bull arrives as staff for the leadership training workshop.

Contradiction: Reading community consensus relative to auxiliary interface. (Wk. 8)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: TM campaign on Guam draws to a close with a fine assembly in the Sagan Dinana—a brand new building. In the showplace, Mardi Gras celebration with masks, Creole food and a parade is highlighted by surprise global slide show that arrived in morning's mail.

Internal: There is a full House for first time in two quarters as Baileys return from Area Suva circuit.

Contradiction: Creating the advantages in the midst of local preoccupation with nationalism. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Linking of Peace Corps expertise and funding with village industry coincides in health services with the establishment of weekly doctor visits, scheduled health workers' care, and upgrading of village clinic.

Internal: House plans five maneuvers to insure thrust in Development activity which rehearses everyman is a Developer.

Contradiction: Enabling village programs to move while operating out of past images of unclear land ownership. (Wk. 11)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Thirty-three regional colleagues gather at San Francisco for a great evening "tribal" meeting with the Panchayat and are impacted with reports on the state of the Movement, Guardian role and India replication.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation presence and role in enabling global visioning and local strategizing revitalizes House to step on it once again in the urban "long march".

Contradiction: Doing weekly maneuver writing on the broad arenas which utilizes all that House knows and engages all available. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: In Cusick, 20 people show up for the first Living Skills Institute (LSI) course and learn about physical fitness. Mayor Bob Bond acts the role of Dr. Lao which proves to be significant in the journey of Cusick.

Internal: The auxiliary goes on fast and broods over stance toward the world.

Contradiction: Sitting on antsiness and anxieties while maintaining focus on what needs to be done so Project doesn't come to complete stop. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: The eclipse happens as predicted with the culmination of maneuvers which include a week of four TMs, two CYFs, two ECFs, the printing of a new Northwest brochure, the send out of David Thomas and Alan Gammel to Maharashtra for a month and a great Movemental event with 40 present to view the new global film.

Internal: The Week II visit of the Panchayat is preceded by last-minute redecoring of new and old spaces and a week of guests in and out for forums and the Panchayat Visitation.

Contradiction: Catching up with the new advantage created and moving with it. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Overall strategic review session breaks loose authentic way to configure into regional impact and building the Movement taskforces. House becomes the training center with a kickoff training night on the ECF.

Internal: Ecclesiola is led by metro colleagues with 17 around table to take first look at *Alternatives* and write riddles.

Contradiction: Building the story that will allow people to risk with confidence and move with courage. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Four from Development and one from Pisinemo raise \$5,500. Pisinemo workday, in preparation for laundromat opening, includes people working on Eagle Scout badges and a family recently retired from 30 years with AID.

Internal: House holds two birthday parties, a great ecclesiola and hosts two Pisinemo HDP permeators holding two jobs each.

Contradiction: Attacking with program when can hardly believe the breadth of possibility where local man is rising again. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Grand opening of Pisinemo Wapkonabud (laundromat) draws 500 to ribbon cutting, raffle drawing and feast. Ten ladies volunteer to staff Wapkonabud for first month.

Internal: Bob and Kate St. Clair stop by for lunch on their way to Phoenix.

Contradiction: Enabling a smooth transition as seven community people become VISTA volunteers. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Regional Campaign News is mailed out to 360 containing the announcement of the first Montanan, Phil Heywood, going to work in an HDP outside the United States—Sungai Lui.

Internal: Fast day is intensified as House views total eclipse of spectacular quality and House cat gives birth to four kittens.

Contradiction: Waiting upon Lord of history, and maintaining a catalytic stance. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: The Panchayat visit, combining with a planning session with VISTA officials from three states, brings a new sense of globality to community members and auxiliary along with a beckoning toward unlimited expansion.

Internal: Youngest member of the House flies to Fargo with his sixth grade class for their sixth grade trek.

Contradiction: Working to develop with the community a long-range picture of serving the three campaigns. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: A record nine TMs are held with 300 total attendance. Three saturation maneuvers going at one time keep trained colleagues busy. Meanwhile, Development commission plans pledge campaign, dividing into three teams and planning home visits. First set-up circuit in Casper, Wyoming, sees meeting with long-time colleagues.

Internal: Laurie Ure, student at Colorado College, sojourns for five days and oversees the collating of 750 TM workbooks as well as attending her first TM.

Contradiction: Weaving the threads of eight different maneuvers into strong rope capable of pulling the region into the future. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Movement for maturation moves ahead with fine Evening at the Institute and visit with Oblate Provincial.

Internal: Images expand as House studies the report on women in ecclesiola, and Week II conversations focus on the seven revolutions.

Contradiction: Creating effective operating images of saturation in midst of all troops focused on self-support victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Fine Community Youth Forum is held in Parkville at secondary school with David Woodbury taking full responsibility as orchestrator.

Internal: House sends out Michael and Elizabeth Neat to Minto Consult set-up team.

Contradiction: Finding wheels for the next month and then deciding about a car. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Tanana Chief's Conference donates time and expertise for Consult. Sam Demetieff of Interior Villagers' Association is firm consultant. Three global slide shows are set up with key authorization and church for village adoption. Work weekend in village gets water, heating and electricity working in village Chief's (now auxiliary) house. House trailer and mobile kitchen trailer are inkinded for Consult.

Internal: Decor workday is a happening with four colleagues engaged full time and taking charge of work.

Contradiction: Coordinating and assessing needs with delivery in three locations. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Meeting with Riversdale community representative unfolds all kinds of interrelationships in the community, and reveals where to move and where not to move.

Internal: House attends film at local congregation, focusing on human rights.

Contradiction: Clarifying the required course of action in the urban complexity. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Auxiliary does stake visitation through the week.

Internal: House makes a hot water heater.

Contradiction: Launching new economy which maintains social ventures. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Two CYFs are held and two more scheduled for Fletcher and Geronimo. Kerr Foundation staff visit Indiahoma with interest in youth, senior citizens and Main Street plaza. Youth bring home awards again from Chattanooga Livestock Fair. County nurse visits with 28 folks getting checkups.

Internal: Sodality highlights conversation on Gandhi coming to visit and what would you show him, exploding the importance of visible signs.

Contradiction: Keeping linkage of towns intact as House would on common concerns. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Survey visits 75.4 percent (352 houses) with 12 teams, 10 students from University of Texas and staff members. Inauguration of officers for Asherton HDP is held at the Catholic parish hall. Robert Harvy builds shelves for the day care.

Internal: Jay Antenen is sent to India and Carrine Adkinson visits the House.

Contradiction: Finding local people who will risk themselves in economic ventures. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Phoning blitz keys week of recruiting for Indiahoma visitation day, Tulsa Metro cadre meeting, and Oklahoma City neighborhood leadership workshop.

Internal: House shrinks as Shelly Reese is sent out for a week of CYF orchestration in eastern Oregon, and Roger Marsh returns to Indiahoma saturation maneuver.

Contradiction: Clarifying total intent of saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Regional meeting in Indiahoma launches Indiahoma Maneuver with five colleagues from Dallas participating.

Internal: Margy Knutsen assumes job as director of preschool in permeation victory.

Contradiction: Discerning the advantages that make for rapid set-up. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Eight TMs and two assemblies are held. Since October, a total of 76 TMs have been held with 3,400 participants. House projects .5 percent of the population will be impacted by the end of April with .5 percent of the adult population having already been reached. Regional TM (assembly) format is tested twice with great excitement. Delta Pace holds two-year vision and plans for second Consult toward next two years and expansion.

Internal: Bertha Pinkston, D. Scott, R. Williams and K. Lush visit for Pace TM participation and TM: Mississippi.

Contradiction: Maintaining one corporate thrust through two campaigns and three Houses, as intensity makes authentic and informed consensus difficult. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Ten TMs are set up in Marksville maneuver. Five thousand leaflets are printed and distributed in Leesville.

Internal: New Orleans cadre meets with House after House Church to plan New Orleans maneuver.

Contradiction: Coordinating TMs and CYFs through precision orchestration, set-up and training. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Mississippi: 200 rolls on with mass mailing from the Governor's office. Academy is cared for with brochure mailing from House.

Internal: First House Church with entire House is celebrated in Memphis in 1979.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time and resources in order to do the tactics which maintain momentum. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Total House weekend foray completes first week of Augusta Maneuver with two TMs set and four in the works. DeKalb County schools set March 30 TM training event for teachers and 400 promised. Atlanta schools youth leadership CYF is set for 75 seniors across city June 2 and 300 promised. Augusta in kind includes United Way office space and phone, and bank's WATS lines. Local TM grads work to set up Americus leg of regional trek.

Internal: Lenten collegium impacts House.

Contradiction: Conquering logistics dragon earlier in the maneuver. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Mighty Month of March roars in with new signs of visibility as ceiling in community center is installed, renovation work on first building in downtown area is initiated, community bulletin board space is reclaimed with calendar and artwork and all street signs in city limits are repaired or put back up.

Internal: Ash Wednesday Daily Office, Lenten symbolic life and ecclesiola provide spirit nurture in midst of externally active week.

Contradiction: Engaging people in the Mighty Month of March maneuvers before other Spring activities capture their fancy. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Lagging spirits are revived in the unexpected excitement of a set-up meeting for a neighborhood forum.

Internal: The arrival of Lent and the *Daily Directions for the Celebration of Lent '79* fills House with gratitude for Church year and colleagues.

Contradiction: Maintaining the comprehensive context for task over against particularizing possibilities within structures of local church. (Wk. 10)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Follow-up of North American Area Priors Council pulls together practical models for next quarter. Visit to John Dunne at Notre Dame reveals a colleague struggling with speaking to global cultures as the Church.

Internal: Nexus argues with *Alternatives* study on India, and creates delightful word game for Isle of Dogs.

Contradiction: Trusting the Lord provides workers when the harvest is ready. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: The 1979 CDBG funding for environmental and housing programs reaches \$51,400. Commercial school graduates this class.

Internal: HDTs guilds are formed and begin plugging into Fifth City HDP programs.

Contradiction: Grasping the objective to attack as a result of comprehensive up-front plans. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: "Low-key" Friday Night Shopping gets a "quiet start" with forty youth at the disco, a senior citizens band at the Village Inn Cafe, a children's movie, Lion's chili and bingo supper and a band and dance at Murphy's White House. Two Lorimor residents attend Regional Council in Kansas City. Great meeting is held with 12 organizations to clarify and plan an exciting annual calendar of events for the community.

Internal: The whole House attends a great Regional Council in Kansas City.

Contradiction: Creating wide-based consensus on the Quarter IV keystone with only two weeks to the community assembly. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: House and Panchayat participate in a key authorization luncheon for the business community. House receives positive reception in Nebraska to TM when contacted for first time since last spring. A dozen colleagues stay after House Church to participate in building a regional Academy recruitment plan.

Internal: The Panchayat's visit includes fantastic Movement dinner, a restful House excursion and two authorization luncheons.

Contradiction: Unblocking "he is the only one who can do x" syndrome. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: South Dakota is visited again for the first time since the Yellow Country Days. All 18 towns visited have not missed a beat since the community gathered a year ago. One town boasts of its cafe, built recently totally through volunteer labor and planning. The South Dakota TM report is in print.

Internal: In anticipation of the next wave of TMs, the Global Servant Force gathers for two training sessions for TM.

Contradiction: Learning how to do the immediate in the light of the comprehensive time and space. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: First Economic Community Forum results in town reaching consensus that its population (now 600) will double in next ten years. Colleagues surprise House by talking to city officials about TM during lunch hour.

Internal: Week II full of engagement (ecclesiola, completing 20 TM packets, workshop on quality TMs) encourages colleague engagement Friday through Sunday.

Contradiction: Completing coal country stronghold and moving to next saturation area. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Acts of God highlight Miracle Month of March as ice storm begins the week, leaving five county stronghold without power, but not stopping VISTA orientation, quarterly assembly, preschool open house or premiere monthly movie, all of which are held in spite of flood waters covering a third of the town.

Internal: House discovers necessity to will one thing and release corporate power.

Contradiction: Holding the tension of being in, but not of, Mill Shoals in a new way. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Preschool playday explodes into new animal at mothers' curriculum-building session. One mother reports that women in the next town want to bring their children. Decision is made to work with two age groups, spiralling curriculum. Another mother volunteers to teach every week to provide continuity.

Internal: As Jackie Cress prepares to leave for India, entire town is caught up in the excitement.

Contradiction: Playing off momentum of recent victories in the social arena to explode the economic. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Meeting with five groups of women in large Roman Catholic church produces GWF for May and opens up CYF opportunities in public school. Complete arrangements are made for great celebration with showing of global film March 31.

Internal: House sends out a prospective intern to Lorimor, welcomes Lauri Miesen back from extended fund raising in Chicago and welcomes Marni Miller for several months as sojourner.

Contradiction: Continuing the push on saturation event set-up in spite of the frustration of a method gap of maintaining a group after the events. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: House pauses in the midst of saturation push to hold a great RS-I for 15 adults at retreat center and six Emerging Generation at House for children's RS-I. Development makes first call on Cummins Engine Foundation in Columbus using Stansbury's India clout for Town Meeting; Indiana funding—great call. Global slide show at Carmel UMC pushes adopt-a-village. Bloomington slide show participants interested in engagement contact the House.

Internal: House begins Lenten season with bi-metro with celebration of Shrove Tuesday breakfast and guests for Ash Wednesday Daily Office.

Contradiction: Calling for destinal decisions in this season of repentance. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: With city and state dignitaries observing, 225 Columbus, Ohio high school students participate in a Community Youth Forum with 48 locally trained students helping with the leadership.

Internal: Lent is launched with seasonal colors, liturgies and conversations.

Contradiction: Maintaining stance of catalysts in the face of multiplying tasks. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: House holds after-church open house for landlord, St. Brigid's Church, and meets many people interested in the TM and two who have already attended one. Regional circuits reveal many colleagues.

Internal: "House goes public" week culminates in three-room decor workday, preparing office, lobby, guild hall and yard for open house.

Contradiction: Establishing death ground in key arenas. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Fourth Codell TM begins with announcement of \$200,000 raised and a list of community accomplishments since first TM in January 1976.

Internal: CETA salary is secured for John Poole to work full-time on TM.

Contradiction: Sorting out the complexity of troops and time organization in three locations. (Wk. 8)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Long Island Days sends double-barrel teams out two days in row to strengthen eight events already scheduled.

Internal: The Panchayat Visitation articulates the global vision of the Order brooding.

Contradiction: Creating a corporate strategy to attain the victory of Week 10 at the regional meeting. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Newsletter, advance introductory letters and new brochures pave the way for set-up. Unsolicited check for \$25 and letter of request for multiple TMs reveal responsiveness to TM.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation catalyzes remaneuver session for Quarters III and IV saturation.

Contradiction: Clarifying role as logistics center and naming someone to be in charge. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: New colleague resolve appears as Buffalo core sets dates for impact assault on Niagara County.

Internal: Approaching Panchayat Visitation provides excuse to paint kitchen and replace some fading decor.

Contradiction: Focusing corporate energies on the real victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Ivy City celebrates Development victory and symbolizes her global participation by sending \$6,000 to the globe.

Internal: Blizzard stops all of DC except the Washington House which takes advantage of enforced isolation with depth reflection during Panchayat Visitation.

Contradiction: Discerning the frame that will allow intensified visibility as Neighborhood Meeting DC moves in. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: The second Widen Open Basketball Tournament is held on Saturday with 14 teams from all over West Virginia. South Charleston takes the title of champ for the second time.

Internal: The past three weeks present visitors from the globe, continents and the region.

Contradiction: Getting water where it is supposed to be, when it is supposed to be there. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Demonstration for clergy in central Pennsylvania breaks open rural strongholds around the UMC.

Internal: Key people from a north Philly TM respond enthusiastically to an invitation to the House for dinner and slides.

Contradiction: Enabling the timeline of events to come off in the time that's there. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Another stronghold in New Jersey, Long Branch, gets launched with the formation of a core, coming in part from old TM grads and in part from a housing coalition called Hope.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation final collegium on universal symbolism pushes House to think way ahead to authentic urban awakening.

Contradiction: Creating a corporate strategy to secure \$12,000 for the quarter. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: "Everyone here today will long remember it!" captures the sense of Starks 184th birthday celebration winter carnival as over 100 attend events, competitions, feast and crown the princess. Twenty-one Starks Trekkers, elementary school age group, take world trek during vacation week and present program to carnival. State-wide workshop leader training session in Augusta prepares MOFGA (Maine Organic Gardeners and Farmers Association) chapters in every county to hold future directions forums in preparation for state conference.

Internal: Jean Stowell returns home after three-week hospital stay, and Laura Griffin places first runner-up in winter carnival princess contest as the Starks Voice candidate.

Contradiction: Operating politically without appearing to do so. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: The remanuever designs a truck to get the Charlotte Valley Firewood Company into production within the month. House sends team to orchestrate a TM in Jasper, New York, set up by VISTA workers.

Internal: Deep freeze weather provides opportunities for neighborly interaction with community.

Contradiction: Continuing to maintain momentum in face of daily setbacks. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Two strongholds are launched with first forum held in Tilton-Northfield, New Hampshire, led by local trained workshop leaders. Three newspapers give press coverage and state Representative is present. Forum produces a six-month timeline for actuation of proposals.

Internal: Study of the *Alternatives* gives a surprising overview and pull-together of news events over the past ten years.

Contradiction: Wanting to focus on one arena of activity for sake of emphasis. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Determining the form of the mission in Quebec. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: First workshop with regional colleagues to set up a computerized colleague retrieval system reveals possibility of instant callbacks in various combinations. Guardians prepare application form for Better Business Bureau. Montreal GWF provides three network possibilities for Toronto and Halton saturation.

Internal: All House women attend GWF in Montreal.

Contradiction: Flipping the colleagues' emphasis from global participation to local engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Portland forum kicks off North Leeds Development days. Sudbury committee decides on 15 forums for April. Multi-cultural youth action forum in Thunder Bay proposes cross-community student exchange program.

Internal: Feverish preparation of new forum workbook causes strange and unearthly time design.

Contradiction: Refining saturation strategy to produce crowds as well as events. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Seventy-two people attend handicrafts meeting and decide on festival at the North Shore of the Gaspé out of proposal at saturation assembly. The economic is given a push with public patrol helping to build funding plans, and design expert gives basic course to home rug hookers.

Internal: House experiences itself as a House again after several weeks of being in two locations.

Contradiction: Spreading the virus of excitement among the community to create an epidemic of engagement in the implementation designs of programs. (Wk. 10)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: *Foro* (TM) state caravans come home with victory of all states either set up or having already had a *Foro*. Key metro colleague, Julie Thonon, provides contact into Ministry of Development for new industry, just before moving to Switzerland.

Internal: Wayne Ormsby arrives from Woburn Lawn on his way to Sol de Septiembre.

Contradiction: Using all community events and construction to elicit and build participation, awareness and leadership. (Wk. 10)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: A fence goes up around the community family garden plot, signaling intentionality to animals and humans. The Ninos del Sol Club marks the closing of the summer vacation program with an urban trip to the zoo experience, and English class evaluations revamp the curriculum for the rest of the quarter.

Internal: A local villager takes House on a "round table" trip to Africa.

Contradiction: Planning events around unpredictable patterns of participation due to time lag between summer harvest and winter planting. (Wk. 11)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Development team hitches ride to Bananeiras with a man who turns out to be an expert in rural electrification and who offers to help in bringing electricity to Bananeiras. A presentation at the Pan American Education Foundation nets one proposal, several individual gifts and a commitment for a GWF in Rio. A call with Sergio Andrade de Carvalho not only nets 25,000 cruzeiro gift, but also entree in Brazilian wealth and power structures. The Bananeiras library is opened with donated books from Rio. The sign at the program center goes up. Okra is marked. Preschool and summer school teachers hold intensive Imaginal Education training session on Saturday. Demonstration gardens sprout with rains. Community meeting with education reports spark community imagination.

Internal: Auxiliary chicken house is enlarged as chickens flourish.

Contradiction: Keeping corporate focus on death ground in the midst of programmatic diversity and carnival preparations. (Wk. 10)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Belingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: The work to organize the health fair next Saturday brings donations of materials, offers to print flyers, and the involvement of Guatemalan doctors, nurses and technicians.

Internal: House sends Rose West back to the USA to do Development and welcomes Steve Workman, who decides to return to sojourn in the near future.

Contradiction: Enabling delays in one program, such as inauguration of the electricity, to enable acceleration of other programs, such as health, agriculture and education. (Wk. 10)

The key contradiction lies in the arena of knowing you can describe the tip of the iceberg, but being unsure as to how to maneuver when most of the iceberg is hidden.

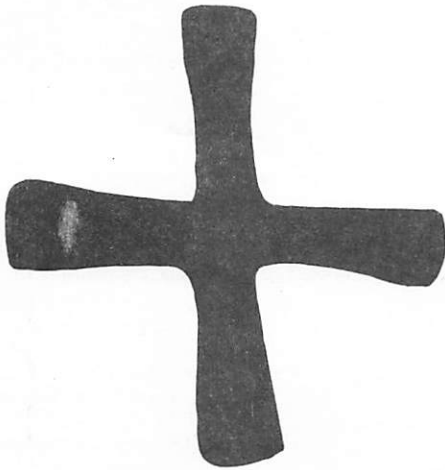
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: House guests number four for House Church with Fr. McCann as celebrant.

Contradiction: Releasing the gifts of the Day II talents to do polis coverage. (Wk. 11)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Regional prefecture authorization from Lyon Polis nets dates for a two-day Consult with regional mayors, park district directors and others, and two TMs in the Marseille Polis.

Internal: House welcomes back Manuel Guillot from three-month HDP circuits in India and spends great evening hearing stories of India.

Contradiction: Discovering effective means to follow up committed monies. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The roof of the industrial building is cleared in preparation for delivery of new tiles. Sample purses, photographs and prose description of wood products go to Milan with exporter. American architect in Rome says yes to being on the ICA: Italy board and designing marketing brochure. Vice-Mayor opens the door to grants for machinery in the future and promises help in filling in the forms for registration of the cooperative in the Chamber of Commerce. Prominent Italian in the Government Agency for the South registers for European Guardians meeting.

Internal: Young English sojourner, niece of Jesuit colleague, helps with roof on Saturday workday.

Contradiction: Providing the training and not just the petrol and persistence that will make the keystone the village's and not the auxiliary's. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: "The Week of Industrial Revolution" in Ijede is highlighted by events in four industries: completion of the main poultry "factory", securing of contract for the sewing industry, books set up and operating for the fishing industry, and arrival of a cinderblock machine capable of producing 1,000 per day. Contract is secured for production of 9,000 blocks for secondary school, and the old Management Committee reorganizes into five committees, one for each industry above, and one for food processing.

Internal: *Ikoyi* (fine downtown neighborhood) living room is secured for Panchayat visit, and two new intern prospects attend House Church.

Contradiction: Consolidating pressure and support for increasing community participation. (Wk. 10)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Funding/framing treks are made in Flanders (Belgium), the Netherlands and Paris while Operations works with Tai'rgwaith on economic development. Charles Hahn is sent out to Bombay Nexus internal audit.

Internal: Nexus fulfills its global role as preparations begin for Global Management Centrum band meeting.

Contradiction: Making systems produce on time to meet deadlines for global reporting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Five TMs and assembly are held for first stage of stronghold with dates set for 12 meetings in next stronghold.

Internal: Collegiums provide glue for the week.

Contradiction: Formulating workshop leader training tactics. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House spends three hours with head of Overijssel Province Director of CRM (National Cultural Ministry) in a collegial call (he has been to Inyan Wakagapi) which helps reflection on strategy and story relative to the powers that be in the Netherlands. House meets with cultural council in Overijssel to plan March 15th meeting to introduce local officials from across province to DD. House discovers over 100 local DD contacts to send newsletters to.

Internal: House hosts young couples on their way (in June) to Kamweleni for six months.

Contradiction: Creating authorization milieu for program which enables creating programmatic milieu for authorization. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Austria formulation team returns with four TMs complete and colleagues committed to a Quarter IV family course in Vienna, Guardians' meeting in Brussels, and some considering Chicago GRA. It's harvest time for this year's Movement building effort as new contacts phone and write to confirm their registration for Area Council and core colleagues do translation of Council material so late into the evening that they stay overnight.

Internal: Elizabeth is sent to United States to attend her father's funeral as Berlin and Brussels troops arrive to prepare for Area Council.

Contradiction: Staying cool when all is within sight and moving closer, but not yet within grasping range. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Three citizens of Kreuzberg Ost join House in Area Council in Frankfurt. The eighteenth edition of *Laterne* finally hits the streets. Four house TMs are set up for next week.

Internal: Half the House attends Continental Council, while the other half catches Development records and thank you's up to date.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to entice people to step into the shoes of leadership. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Consultants John Parry and Greg Farley start mobile, cheap corrugated cement roofing sheet industry that can be reproduced anywhere in the world.

Internal: Half (party) caps off week of successful brick burn and roofing industry launch and brings the refreshment of a multi-cultured celebration.

Contradiction: Utilizing new technique to catalyze the village's decision to re-do its space. (Wk. 12)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Workday on polishing the community and the village symbols is completed as signs and painted building take on new look. Kawangware LENS pleases local leadership and opens door to continuing serious planning. Key meeting with government officials is held in Machakos, location of Kamweleni, to wrap up LENS plans and dates. Family from Israel, pediatrician and director of pharmaceutical company interested in working in Kawangware, come for a visit. Two hundred fifty pullets (chickens) arrive on DUF. Nairobi City Council and Mayor come to Kawangware.

Internal: Visitors begin arriving from around the globe in the form of the LENS team: Loudermilks, Adam Thomson and Tom Greyslock, and Development systems team of Bob and Shirley Porter, giving the feel of the global swirl that is ahead this month.

Contradiction: Identifying the corporate death ground which defines the troop configuration that will win. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutiwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Five villagers are cleared to receive Rs5,000 agricultural loans each on Republic Day. Sugar factory agrees to buy village cane crop at double the price received locally. Stake meetings begin. Visit by Block Development Officer assures of his firm support.

Internal: Sripal, a village youth, dies and auxiliary and villagers celebrate his completed life.

Contradiction: Locating permanent village facility and formalizing guild structures to unblock tactical thinking. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: After visiting village and determining expertise needs for Consult, House builds consultant recruitment system which will be activated Week 10.

Internal: House participates in Hindu family death anniversary celebration.

Contradiction: Securing temporary lodging in Jamshedpur to release auxiliary to intensify Project set-up. (Wk. 12)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Week II planning event brings renewed clarity on remaining task for year with centrum maneuvers rationale charts, timelines and budgets drawn up for the next four months.

Internal: Premiere showing of global film is great event after film is rejected by prescribed model of Bell and Howell projector.

Contradiction: Keeping corporate focus to ensure the win. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: House creates structure formats to do planning and implementing quickly.

Internal: Harry arrives, Mudj is sent out and Judy starts work.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive planning while moving 100,000 miles an hour. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGA LUI

External: Villagers report a public statement by the D.O. declaring Sungai Lui an example village for the rest of the District. The week is highlighted by two successful site visits. Work in Kota Kinabalu confirms Board membership in Sabah. After weeks of investigative work into personal loan records, the Hong Kong and Shanghai Bank's 3,000 loan to the *Pasar* (market) is deposited with 30-month repayment plan. As if struck by some mysterious force, all vehicles (car, jeep and truck) break down within hours of each other.

Internal: Brightly colored chalk tracks maneuvers for the rest of the quarter on a third blackboard in the collegium room.

Contradiction: Finding the right straw in the middle of the road on the outside of the village into the center ring as the circus' main attraction. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Second LENS in six days, with Booher and Tomlinson, impacts 31 executives of richest government-owned plantation in Indonesia (156,000 acres of oil palm, cocoa, rubber and coconuts). Included are five wives of top executives. Mr. Soedjai, ICA patron and general manager of PTP VI sees his execs welded into a team before his eyes. Mrs. Soedjai arranges GWF for Week 10 and collects USD125 to finish Bubun "thinking House" in symbolic center of Bubun. Four PTP VI people plan visit to Bubun Week 9 including couple who are managers for 6,000-family transmigration scheme in Central Sumatra. House receives Rp. 7.7 million from LENS and provincial sources (USD12,400) of which USD3,000 is for self-support. Sewing guild ladies pay three-quarters of trip expenses to Medan to research contracts. House meets with subdistrict head (CAMAT) and district parliament representatives who want to know how they can help Bubun develop.

Internal: New room is built for guests, kitchen is painted ice blue in Sunday workday and kerosene range with three burners and oven is installed.

Contradiction: Focusing on impact of whole and power of pressure point buttons. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Key businesswoman in Ujung Pandang in kinds four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Entire House attends mosque for Mauhid, celebration of Mohammed's birthday.

Contradiction: Objectifying land ownership situation to release economic paralysis. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Troops stay on, following Hong Kong Area Council, for finance meeting and campaign planning. Nexus sends out Geni Philbrook to Philippines for Mactan saturation.

Internal: Workshop begins expanded search for new facility. Ken Hamje returns from Brussels and reports on strategy for spheres. House celebrates Beth Hamje's 12th birthday.

Contradiction: Finding a perspective other than the nation to determine what needs to happen. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: YMCA begins activity group with six 10-year-olds. Youth evaluate newsletters and plan articles for third newsletter.

Internal: Area Council in Hong Kong gives Catherine Cheng of Hai Ou and Wong Ching On a chance to visit Nam Wai.

Contradiction: Implementing full village participation in Nam Wai Foundation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guard says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic centerprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Project industries are delivered, checks picked up and new orders negotiated. Development follows up site visit from Canadian Embassy, Citibank and UNICEF while again closing month surpassing monthly goal.

Internal: House attends celebrative Area Council in Hong Kong where plans are laid for Quarter IV and initial thinking is done for next year.

Contradiction: Determining long-range plans and the blending of campaigns. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Largest developed gift in Taipei from one company is promised for USD2,000. Lions Club programs are confirmed in eight countries.

Internal: House members return from Area Hong Kong Council with projection of self-support and task victories for the year.

Contradiction: Leaping from phase II of the Town Meeting campaign to phase III in the midst of doing phase II. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan 216 task force completes materials, decor, site selection and troop training model, including 5,000 forum workbooks, authorization letters from the Governor of Cebu, and T-shirts for the 100 Forum staff. New cluster industries reach production high. Buri factories in all five locations achieve higher quality rating than Sudtonggan alone ever reached. Sudtonggan Craft sends out 100 invitations to the opening of its new production/display center and the Cluster Rock Industry hires rock sales manager. San Miguel (cluster village) cuts ribbon on new preschool building.

Internal: Area Council in Hong Kong reveals budget for coming quarter twice as large as any previous quarter and the Development capacity to support it, catalyzing celebration.

Contradiction: Doing the three-step dance (*tinikling*)—Mactan 216, Mactan Cluster, and Blue Shirt Formation—without missing a beat. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: New health clinic building arrives, and a community kitchen is built with wooden posts and tin roof. Free vaccinations are given and consultation for the people when doctor from Davao City Health Department comes to Langub for a day. One hectare of land is plowed by two tractors. One hundred forty students from the University of Mindanao beautify Langub in a workday. Two mushroom beds are finished. Three varieties of vegetables are planted. A goat fence is started. Brick kiln construction is started and sewing marketing is expanded.

Internal: House welcomes Teresita Taguding (Tessie), a newly-graduated agriculturalist sent by the Bureau of Agricultural Extension to work full-time in the Project.

Contradiction: Enabling local people to see the possibility of great things continuing to happen even without the help of outsiders. (Wk. 12)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Mr. Kimura, Secretary General of the National Mayors' Association for Towns and Villages, introduces ICA to Mr. Ishikawa of the National Governors' Association who agrees to help staff see the appropriate people in each prefecture and begins with an introduction to Mr. Miyara, who agrees to set up appointment with Social Education Director in Okinawa.

Internal: Special collegiums with English sojourners is a real happening as everyone gets involved in targeting towns for TMs in the Kanto Plains.

Contradiction: Marshalling the troops to secure the TM victory in Japan. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: In the midst of continuing renovation on the preschool building, a grand graduation is held at the training center in which 16 students are sent out to attend first grade at Hwang Yung Il Si primary school. Miss Hyun Kee Jung is honored by the many parents and friends in attendance for her three years of faithful teaching.

Internal: Third quarter USAID progress report is completed on national holiday, the 60th anniversary of independence movement.

Contradiction: Moving the leadership to expand and to assume more responsibility in the midst of seasonal return to the fields. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House experiences week of abounding opportunity as Song Chul accompanies Peace Corps survey of leper village community development possibilities. Korean Methodist church gives initial nod to grant of \$10,000 lot east of Seoul for training center, and head of 400,000 Methodist women indicates GWF interest.

Internal: Discomfort of two heatless days in freezing weather and frozen water pipes give way to warm greeting for back House checks and arrival of third ITT grant.

Contradiction: Deciding rather than wondering about how to loose the secret of history in an ancient society immersed in economic recreation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Village planning for next year is done in one-day TM format, emphasizing completion of three buildings in next two weeks, village road surfacing by April one-year celebration, and building this Spring.

Internal: First annual ICA nonprofit corporate report is submitted to government.

Contradiction: Relating the Project bridgehead to the other campaigns and to replication in the future, while keeping feet firm on the bridgehead. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Father Mahoney from local Catholic church drops by with surprise visit to bring the good news with their TM pamphlet and 10,000 yen from the TM last Sunday. House finds time amidst teaching duties to accomplish nine calls to major companies in Fukuoka City.

Internal: House sends Bob and Jean out to Area Priors Council in Korea and to Okinawa.

Contradiction: Following up on Development leads after making good start. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Three TM circuits netting two yeses, four slideshow presentations, and a women's event with 19 participants are the result of February's TM circuit learnings.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. Yoshifumi Yabushita and Miss Nobuko Nagata as trainees.

Contradiction: Cutting across visionary dreaming to get out the practical actions that will make this week happen. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Fifteen Oyubari high school students participate in Sunday workday on the Oyubari Training Center. Follow-up TM mailing is sent to 49 towns in Hokkaido. Maneuver is set for March in the "Tohoku" district of northern Japan.

Internal: House welcomes Mr. Otobe as week-long sojourner.

Contradiction: Moving Oyubari into new phase of its development. (Wk. 11)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Development holds 21 visits, raising \$800 in hand and \$1,300 committed. In the mail money exceeds February bottom line and teams add another \$20,000 to the bottom line. Tour of the office files reveals dusty, but exciting, old CMA documents. Shire in the center of New South Wales is golded in great Aboriginal community meeting.

Internal: First issue of the *Juicy Grapevine* (area interchange) goes out.

Contradiction: Empowering the internal life of the Religious House and releasing significant corporate time to CMA push. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: In kind victories keep occurring and the circuit rationale is laid out with folders created for each one. The House lies ready and waiting for the golding troops to arrive.

Internal: Ian Clover finishes intern year and begins his final year of architectural studies.

Contradiction: Breaking open in kind and network contacts without depending on the troops that have yet to arrive. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: The great Week of the Thrilling Thirteen, including teams doing five meetings this week, gives the state campaign a new look. House receives second \$25,000 this year from major Melbourne foundation.

Internal: House size leaps to 24 (including Development, special forces, and the area prior) while food expenses drop by 50% as in kind goes wild, including 25 pounds of meat, fish and poultry.

Contradiction: Winning this war and readying the next step. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Phone calls in two nights from Brussels, Singapore, Hong Kong, Bombay and all around Australia on authorization emphasize globality of Development. House returns from area council and then three out of four adults disappear to other cities on TM and HDP assignments. Department of Health says preliminary yes to \$25,000 before June for Murrin Bridge.

Internal: House hosts Sue Chapman's parents for dinner to celebrate Sue's engagement to John Burbidge and for all four to discuss wedding preparations.

Contradiction: Getting state campaign names quickly. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Seven more CMAs complete phase I of campaign. Development adds clout to momentum with \$5,500 in proposals submitted to Queensland companies. Key businessman asks for proposals for Bank of Queensland, Provincial Traders and Permanent Finance.

Internal: House celebrates completion of CMA phase I at the Bavarian Steak House, complete with pakka band, wine and apple streudel.

Contradiction: Utilizing the momentum of CMA to formulate the Global Servant Force. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Twelve people from local district come for "Friends of Murrin Bridge" workshop. First consignment of 200 mattress covers arrives for sewing industry. Two community mothers attend local school parents' meeting. "Friday Night Special" prelude of BBQ celebrates week's victories.

Internal: House continues lunch-time meetings with community.

Contradiction: Calling forth new form of discipline to counteract old tendency of part-time engagement. (Wk. 12)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: The Marshall Islands, anticipating the end of the trusteeship, ratifies a constitution providing a parliamentary form of government. House and guild hear extensive reports on Area Suva.

Internal: House welcomes Baileys with first-ever celebration "on-the-town" and sets the stage for rethinking the future in a new context.

Contradiction: Writing the script as you go, when you get on stage and realize the scenery has been changed. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Linking of Peace Corps expertise and funding with village industry coincides in health services with the establishment of weekly doctor visits, scheduled health workers' care, and upgrading of village clinic.

Contradiction: Enabling village programs to move while operating out of past images of unclear land ownership. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Thirty-three regional colleagues gather at San Francisco for a great evening "tribal" meeting with the Panchayat and are impacted with reports on the state of the Movement, Guardian role and India replication.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation presence and role in enabling global visioning and local strategizing revitalizes House to step on it once again in the urban "long march".

Contradiction: Doing weekly maneuver writing on the broad arenas which utilizes all that House knows and engages all available. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: In Cusick, 20 people show up for the first Living Skills Institute (LSI) course and learn about physical fitness. Mayor Bob Bond acts the role of Dr. Lao which proves to be significant in the journey of Cusick.

Internal: The auxiliary goes on fast and broods over stance toward the world.

Contradiction: Sitting on antsiness and anxieties while maintaining focus on what needs to be done so Project doesn't come to complete stop. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: The eclipse happens as predicted with the culmination of maneuvers which include a week of four TMs, two CYFs, two ECFs, the printing of a new Northwest brochure, the send out of David Thomas and Alan Gammel to Maharashtra for a month and a great Movemental event with 40 present to view the new global film.

Internal: The Week II visit of the Panchayat is preceded by last-minute redecoring of new and old spaces and a week of guests in and out for forums and the Panchayat Visitation.

Contradiction: Catching up with the new advantage created and moving with it. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Tenth Street School Mothers Club TM draws strong response from 50 Spanish-speaking mothers, school administrators, and ARCO community volunteers. Calls net GWF in Redlands and a Special Issues Forum with Indochinese refugees. Development drums up lots of dollars.

Internal: A week of dispersion is highlighted by a small ecclesiola and a wild birthday celebration at House Church. An impromptu House meeting occurs at an evening meal, demonstrating that issues are never the block.

Contradiction: Keeping proposal writing for program funding as top priority in the midst of many immediate demands. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Four from Development and one from Pisinemo raise \$5,500. Pisinemo workday, in preparation for laundromat opening, includes people working on Eagle Scout badges and a family recently retired from 30 years with AID.

Internal: House holds two birthday parties, a great ecclesiola and hosts two Pisinemo HDP permeators holding two jobs each.

Contradiction: Attacking with program when can hardly believe the breadth of possibility where local man is rising again. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Laundromat grosses \$115 in first week, attracts from village 30 miles distant, and adds coffee and pop to stock. Nine VISTA volunteers travel to Las Vegas for VISTA orientation.

Internal: Colleagues return from HDTs.

Contradiction: Building the framework of polity that enables the next phase of the Project to build on the momentum of the situation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Self-support takes a giant step forward when two days after the house is put up for sale, an offer is received to buy it.

Internal: Collegium room is transformed with gift of french door curtains and the three campaign dynamics decor.

Contradiction: Expanding scope of missional engagement to include permeation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: House and colleague tour reservation with eye toward the future. Cannon Ball Industries operates a display booth at Bismarck Home Builders Show. S. Lyman, J. Two Bears, and L. Little Bird return from HDTs. Patches for community friendship quilt are now out to all but 12 households in town.

Internal: House rescues Curtis Brave Bull from nine-week cabin fever, and ends the week with a visit to Bismarck Builders Show, pizza and a movie.

Contradiction: Creating the momentum that the thaw makes possible. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Boulder, Martin Acres neighborhood, climaxes its neighborhood TMs with an assembly with 103 in attendance. Brighton Maneuver continues with six more TMs and preparation for the final week of the maneuver. Fred spends two days in Laramie, Wyoming, doing training in preparation for TMs beginning Week 13. Office receives used ditto machine from local church.

Internal: House spends Week I making sure House personnel and regional colleagues get to TMs with food in their stomachs, markers in the box and sufficient gas in the car and catches breath with 40 hours of discontinuity during Week II in preparation for another full week.

Contradiction: Continuing to mold future victories in midst of accomplishing present ones. (Wk. 12)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Board Meeting is a resounding success as colleagues become deeply involved in ecclesiola "Heroes" conversation and Middle East study.

Internal: All troops are employed as Ben Parker begins work as evening receptionist at a hotel.

Contradiction: Maximizing the use of time with present troops and work schedules. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Fine Community Youth Forum is held in Parkville at secondary school with David Woodbury taking full responsibility as orchestrator.

Internal: House sends out Michael and Elizabeth Neat to Minto Consult set-up team.

Contradiction: Finding wheels for the next month and then deciding about a car. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Tanana Chief's Conference donates time and expertise for Consult. Sam Demetieff of Interior Villagers' Association is firm consultant. Three global slide shows are set up with key authorization and church for village adoption. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

Contradiction: Gathering the scattered Project activities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Lagging spirits are revived in the unexpected excitement of a set-up meeting for a neighborhood forum.

Internal: The arrival of Lent and the *Daily Directions for the Celebration of Lent '79* fills House with gratitude for Church year and colleagues.

Contradiction: Maintaining the comprehensive context for task over against particularizing possibilities within structures of local church. (Wk. 10)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Four faculty are sent to Rio to set up ITI. Two LENS seminars are held simultaneously in Nairobi and Seattle. Development sends grassroots mailing aimed at women.

Internal: Training, Inc. (self-support clerical training program) is contacted by Channel 5 and Washington Post to report on 100 percent of class graduating and 60 percent job placement.

Contradiction: Mobilizing large numbers of troops who historically have not moved. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Fifth City community members volunteer to supervise recreational activities at the gymnasium. Fifth City Voice is ready for distribution with students' drawings on snow from Leif Erickson School and front page photo of HDTs grads.

Internal: House receives Panchayat Visitation which ends in celebration Sunday evening at the Serbian Club.

Contradiction: Making transition into Quarter IV with celebrations while actions are tied to closing out and continuing to end Quarter III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Asssets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly

committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

External: Lorne man, on Development team, acting as middle man, sells potato bags as company public relations, and nets \$500 for Lorne HDP. Religious orders are receptive to Lorne HDP work as they see sharing a common vision. House has \$150,000 working in loans and donations.

Internal: Evening readings and conversations on the wind are refreshing during six-week Trade Winds Maneuver.

Contradiction: Recreating breadth of community involvement in the living environment at this time when Spring is anticipated and people want to do something. (Wk. 12)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: *Foro* (TM) state caravans come home with victory of all states either set up or having already had a *Foro*. Key metro colleague, Julie Thonon, provides contact into Ministry of Development for new industry, just before moving to Switzerland.

Internal: Wayne Ormsby arrives from Woburn Lawn on his way to Sol de Septiembre.

Contradiction: Using all community events and construction to elicit and build participation, awareness and leadership. (Wk. 10)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Sewing industry completes and distributes first school uniform with production of others well underway. First ears of corn are harvested from demonstration corn plot. Foundation Chile makes a presentation to the community on the greenhouse experiment. Sector workdays intensify sector consciousness. Celebration ends day.

Internal: House sends Kathy Lowther to assignment in Lima to join Project set-up team, and receives Judy Tresise and Wayne Ormsby. Wayne is the first auxiliary coming from Woburn Lawn, Jamaica.

Contradiction: Assuming responsibility of leadership and launching new arenas of work. (Wk. 12)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Community workday produces Bananeiras' first mural in the plaza on a store side, and a permanent map of the community and global grid on the bulletin board, and a mini-park with flowers in plaza area. Ten villagers receive eye exams as part of inkinded ophthalmologist services in Rio Bonito. Closing ceremony of the summer school program focuses on scholastic accomplishment of children and ends with marching and singing down the main streets. The Portuguese copies of the Consult document arrive.

Internal: Fast Day and visit from international guest on the same day impact all with relatedness to the globe.

Contradiction: Finding the forms of the next phase of adult engagement. (Wk. 12)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkinds food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Bellingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: The work to organize the health fair next Saturday brings donations of materials, offers to print flyers, and the involvement of Guatemalan doctors, nurses and technicians.

Internal: House sends Rose West back to the USA to do Development and welcomes Steve Workman, who decides to return to sojourn in the near future.

Contradiction: Enabling delays in one program, such as inauguration of the electricity, to enable acceleration of other programs, such as health, agriculture and education. (Wk. 10)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports several firsts: in Singapore, the month of February lands US\$60,000 deposited, Hong Kong receives first major grant of HK\$5,000 from Chinese family foundation providing first entree into Chinese foundations, while Bombay hosts World Bank visitor to Maliwada, with positive response. In Chicago, the Singapore Ambassador is visited, in Washington, with a letter to Singapore forthcoming. Town Meeting campaigns are building on umbrella funding possibilities and troop resources as evidenced in Arizona, Colorado, and California. In Japan, the sponsorship of the private sector involves major funding, employees' volunteer involvement, and designation of senior management personnel to be active on Board of Advisors. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting a jump on Quarter IV by creating campaign imagery, schedules and coordinated maneuvers to close the year at \$5.5 million globally.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a week of reflection on the spirit journey of the religious (the retreat), local man (the HDTs), and mankind in these times (John Dunne) moving centrum to raise again the question of the Church and the end-run. What does it mean when the Academy seems to be almost recruiting itself? The key contradiction lies in the arena of having no image of Quarter I with it being only three consuming months away.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the Loudermilks complete four LENS seminars in Nairobi and one in Lagos. LENS is also scheduled with Royal Trust Company, one of Canada's largest banks. GSD strike forces move with strength in Asherton and Mill Shoals HDPs. Booher returns from European continental council. Campaign convergence takes practical form as the continent prepares to pull together behind North American 19 with impact, acceleration and Guardian support. The key contradiction lies in the arena of providing clear images to the continent that reveal urgency and give practical focus to engagement.

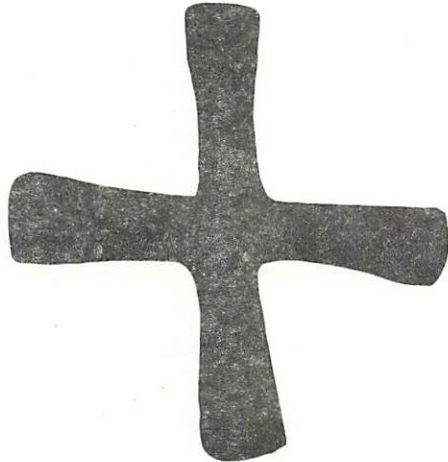
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: CYF trek to Manchester sets up two CYFs in three days and visits many longtime colleagues who are most impressed to meet a real live "Order Youth" (Jennifer McClelland). Presentation to Missionary Institute training organization for Roman Catholic Church, with seven orders and 20 nations present results in **request for one day training session** on the Isle of Dogs.

Internal: House sends out Don Cramer to France TM campaign.

Contradiction: Moving from the image of "They Shoot Horses, Don't They?" to "Wagons Ho!" (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Twenty-five attend the Turriff Community Youth Forum and six youth want to lead other CYFs in the Aberdeen metro. Youth Forums gear to accelerate as global youth strike force is sent out to Manchester.

Internal: Marge Allan returns from Continental Council with tales of the new European orbit, as Doug Allan reports for duty in the French blitz.

Contradiction: Catching the small waves on the surf board, not knowing when the large wave will strike. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Persistent activation of frame breaks loose avalanche of new possibility as 5,000 British pounds surety loan is offered to TCS by INCO who promise further 3,000 British pounds loan from CISWO secretary who is hosted in grand style by management board. Leadership demonstrates new sense of responsibility as Project secretary makes available her front room for office and community TM team sets up neighboring village in stronghold experiment.

Internal: House sends off David Coffman to France and celebrates funding break loose and auxiliary house secured until April 1980.

Contradiction: Globalizing emerging leadership as demands on local move them into new realm of responsibility. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Community Youth Forum team of Jennifer McClelland and Christine Mead lays groundwork for three Forums—two in Manchester polis and one in Sheffield polis.

Internal: Adam Thomson breezes through Manchester from Nairobi LENS trek to celebrate Paul Thomson's second birthday and is sent out to France polis completion trek.

Contradiction: Doing Quarter IV Week One Development maneuver to meet April Development target. (Wk. 13)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: The Diamond Hexagon Campaign launches six circuits. Miracles to prepare the launch are arrival of 20 people, inkind, creation of a brochure and 1400 French francs to start the Development ball rolling.

Internal: Great celebration includes creation of story, song and symbol to launch Diamond Hexagon Maneuver, with people from every House.

Contradiction: Creating momentum necessary to release Quarter IV's maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: First chair leg is bent. Three electrical installation trucks converge on Termine opening up a new street, catalyzed by wiring needs of industry building. Bulldozers prepare secondary village roads for cobblestones. Invitations for April 7th industry building opening go out.

Internal: Representatives to European Council arrive with reports of great event, and full program check. Strike force troops, Roger and Joyce Williams, follow.

Contradiction: Remembering your revolutionary context in the midst of prolonged maneuvers on roof, wiring, machinery and marketing. (Wk. 13)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Six Ijede villagers complete passport applications to symbolize readiness to attend HDTI:Kawangware. Two thousand chicks arrive as a result of conversation with Barclay's Bank loan officer. Accomplished rural health doctor, Hilton of Garkida Project in N. Nigeria, has dinner with several auxiliary staff, invites Project to send a villager for training. First accurate map of Ijede is finally finished and duplicated for stakes.

Internal: Weekend of village celebrations has all staff, including youngest Emerging Generation, aglow with celebrative spirit.

Contradiction: Grasping the internal and external financial implications of village industrial ventures. (Wk. 13)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Funding/framing treks are made in Flanders (Belgium), the Netherlands and Paris while Operations works with Tair'gwaith on economic development. Charles Hahn is sent out to Bombay Nexus internal audit.

Internal: Nexus fulfills its global role as preparations begin for Global Management Centrum band meeting.

Contradiction: Making systems produce on time to meet deadlines for global reporting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Twenty-five percent of village comes to TM in stronghold. A second French training session at House with Paris troops continues House interchange.

Internal: Morning with Global Operations Centrum clarifies issues and victory circle for House.

Contradiction: Polishing a stronghold while setting up two more. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House spends three hours with head of Overijssel Province Director of CRM (National Cultural Ministry) in a collegial call (he has been to Inyan Wakagapi) which helps reflection on strategy and story relative to the powers that be in the Netherlands. House meets with cultural council in Overijssel to plan March 15th meeting to introduce local officials from across province to DD. House discovers over 100 local DD contacts to send newsletters to.

Internal: House hosts young couples on their way (in June) to Kamweleni for six months.

Contradiction: Creating authorization milieu for program which enables creating programmatic milieu for authorization. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Area Council enables House to find a judge who wants to do TMs because he sees the need of renewed community spirit and the inadequacy of simply punishing law breakers. House meets with 50 folks, many of whom had never seen each other before, but who were eager to work together, quickly prints the new German ICA brochure, finds an unlimited supply of 18 inch-wide tables stored less than one-tenth of a mile from the House, invites a 14-year-old regional colleague to fulfill her wish to spend nine hours in the kitchen enabling the Council. One usually quiet, shy lady, surprised even herself by boldly suggesting to close the Council meeting by singing "On Top of the World."

Internal: The Scheitler family comes to inspect their possible future home during the weekend of Council along with Paula Philbrook from Brussels and a swirl of 17 from Kreuzberg Ost—and the House isn't a bit crowded. The TM circuiters return to base for the Council, spend a half day swapping stories and strategies, and celebrate the victory of more than 110 *Gemeindeforums* done in a land where 216 is the magic number.

Contradiction: Doing that which can be done rather than that which is impossible. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Second exciting Guardians meeting is held with key Berlin businessmen dealing with public relations issues on same day, three stake TMs are held in Houses. Major proposals are to knock down hinterhoff walls and build community rooms.

Internal: Continental Council assigns 20 troops from across Europe to do polis coverage of TM. Berlin sends Kathy Convey to complete France.

Contradiction: Getting out of a financial hole. (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Monthly Bilharzia eradication campaign is kicked off with every family visited, and three more water taps put in. A new kiln for the brick factory is completed. Twenty contributors and Guardians are hosted in Cairo and shown the Global Film, a fine evening.

Internal: Development Systems team, Panchayat visitation and the Dettmans, Guardians from Minnesota, pass through and bring with them many gifts, including a copy of the global film.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum in the midst of manipulating the red tape for usage of land for desert reclamation, brick factory, and new building site. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Guardians and community are impacted by Human Development film as the globe intrudes and releases new possibilities for representative care in the local and deepens realization of Kawangware as a sign to the world.

Internal: Global Order training comes alive as deep questions are raised of the Panchayat by local staff.

Contradiction: Intensifying Movement common memory in order that the 100 in Blue is a reality. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Five villagers are cleared to receive Rs5,000 agricultural loans each on Republic Day. Sugar factory agrees to buy village cane crop at double the price received locally. Stake meetings begin. Visit by Block Development Officer assures of his firm support.

Internal: Sripal, a village youth, dies and auxiliary and villagers celebrate his completed life.

Contradiction: Locating permanent village facility and formalizing guild structures to unblock tactical thinking. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for pre-school uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: One more Development check is received. Office space and phone are inkinded. First consultant commitment is confirmed.

Internal: *The Way of All the Earth* study includes the rehearsal of the life of Buddha who experienced life in the state where the Calcutta Project is being located.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum on Project set up while initiating and intensifying Development. (Wk. 13)

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: One adult, two Youth and three Emerging Generation man the Nexus while all four centurms are on the road.

Internal: Isobel Bishop celebrates year three of Phase III several times—once in Australia, once at the Nexus and twice with her family.

Contradiction: Spiraling ecclesiola and collegium formats for two Youth and three Emerging Generation. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Fascination with machines allows for the eventfulness of stake *gotong rayongs* with chain saw and new lawn mower. Trips as ambassadors to other communities include two health caretakers accompanying Sabah Foundation flying doctor in helicopter to villages inaccessible by road preparing for a state-wide demonstration of ICA health care methods and 25 handicraft workers journeying by inkinded bus to a large handicraft fair and exhibit 50 miles away.

Internal: House collegium room is in fine shape to welcome unexpected emissary of Chief Minister, head of Community Development Center.

Contradiction: Training the emerging leadership while using the entire village to bring off the victories. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI

External: Exciting first visit with State Officer from Veterinary Services may lead to a new frontier opening up with cattle raising in the village. Two village youth with auxiliary, Zainal, meet with District Officer of Youth, Culture and Sports who is very interested in helping a group of youth start another chicken farm. Auxiliary staff gets robbed while escorting four women to quilting class, and one of the women chases and aids the police in catching the thief. Comprehensive breakdown of all vehicles sparks discovery of skilled mechanic right here in the village who returns his first bill as a donation. Eli Lily contributes \$300 and promises professional assistance.

Internal: Rajah's formal invitation from Chicago Nexus enables visa procedures to begin. Alice and Joel arrive to work this week. House staff join in with village for outing at nearby recreation park.

Contradiction: Giving momentum to Project as if it is brand new and feeling of not yet being on solid ground. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives a strong yes of endorsement from the Vice-Governor of West Java. Forty villagers help to pay for two villagers who went to Bandung. New guilds are created and are now meeting in six village locations. Auxiliary begins five-month theater maneuvers to prepare for the completion of Kelapa Dua by the end of June.

Internal: Gordon Harper arrives to begin preparation for the area training module.

Contradiction: Creating village structures of self-support with government participation and on-going jobs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Second LENS in six days, with Booher and Tomlinson, impacts 31 executives of richest government-owned plantation in Indonesia (156,000 acres of oil palm, cocoa, rubber and coconuts). Included are five wives of top executives. Mr. Soedjai, ICA patron and general manager of PTP VI sees his execs welded into a team before his eyes. Mrs. Soedjai arranges GWF for Week 10 and collects USD125 to finish Bubun "thinking House" in symbolic center of Bubun. Four PTP VI people plan visit to Bubun Week 9 including couple who are managers for 6,000-family transmigration scheme in Central Sumatra. House receives Rp. 7.7 million from LENS and provincial sources (USD12,400) of which USD3,000 is for self-support. Sewing guild ladies pay three-quarters of trip expenses to Medan to research contracts. House meets with subdistrict head (CAMAT) and district parliament representatives who want to know how they can help Bubun develop.

Internal: New room is built for guests, kitchen is painted ice blue in Sunday workday and kerosene range with three burners and oven is installed.

Contradiction: Focusing on impact of whole and power of pressure point buttons. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP

External: Key businesswoman in Ujung Pandang inkind four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Entire House attends mosque for Mauhid, celebration of Mohammed's birthday.

Contradiction: Objectifying land ownership situation to release economic paralysis. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Two Nexus personnel participate in 105 GCFs in five days on Mactan Island.

Internal: Return of most troops allows possibility of low-key mind-blowing reporting and visioning on breakloose across zone.

Contradiction: Accelerating momentum occasioned by the breakloose while keeping one eye on the necessary future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Jardines, the oldest and original "Taipan" company emerges as Nam Wai Foundation joint venture partner as landowners are paid HK\$13,500,000 by the Foundation for their land. Community Forum set up begins with two good possibilities from first call and all materials printed. Dental clinic site and dental nurse volunteers to train villagers as assistants are secured. Elders donate soft drinks to volunteers working with children in tutorial groups.

Internal: House is represented at wedding of Victor Liu, long-time colleague.

Contradiction: Involving the youth in all programs at a time when many distractions draw them from the village. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Project sells 58,000 prawn fry at US\$600 profit and receives 400,000 more fry. One hundred crocodiles arrive and do battle with cold. Coast Guard says yes to building community center. Pond Owners Guild holds celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Chinese New Year of Sheep with dinner at villagers' houses.

Contradiction: Stabilizing economic enterprises by solidifying local managers and facilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Forty businessmen gather for lunch at five-star hotel to look at future of ICA in Philippines and to receive thanks for their past support. Development presents 20 new proposals. Levi Strauss delivers 100 pairs of Levis and T-shirts for the 50 Filipino "blue shirts". An order for villages to produce new craft item for export is received after site visit to Sudtonggan, Citibank, pleased with their Rock Industry investment, now offers to buy jeep for transportation system of five Mactan villages.

Internal: House has end of Development trek celebration with brunch at local restaurant.

Contradiction: Staging the next leap now, with victory for the year in hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: First Guardians' meeting in Taiwan takes on the task of working through legal structures for Hai Ou economic development and investment opportunities. First Lions Club TM in Taichung in central Taiwan, is a great success with 20 local businessmen present.

Internal: House celebrates Women's Day in Taiwan.

Contradiction: Doing framing that ensures the victory of the five maneuvers for the year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: One hundred cluster villagers gather to launch Mactan 216, building village maneuvers at the same time so no beat is skipped. First 100 Forums are held with excitement island-wide.

Internal: Carl Hickey, Geni Philbrook, Tony Elizondo and Ben Agirang arrive to join Mactan 216.

Contradiction: Developing willingness to fail in order to capture future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Agriculture breakloose begins with new vegetable farm planting. A borrowed tractor plows three hectares for mango farm. The fence gets up on the goat ranch and mushroom production increases to one new batch a day. Water pump is obtained for water system and two new water tanks are donated. First doctors to visit new health clinic treat over 100 people.

Internal: House welcomes Sr. Diana from Manila as sojourner and Department of Agriculture assigns one field worker to live with House and work full-time in Langub.

Contradiction: Giving the load to the village. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Pepsico signs on as a Town Meeting: Japan sponsor for 1,000,000 yen. National strategy meeting plans seven maneuvers by June to finish first phase. Okinawa trip identifies five villages for an HDP and secures the endorsement and support of Vice Governor Higa.

Internal: Mean Byong Woo moves in as a two-year sojourner.

Contradiction: Finding effective riders and shortcuts that will allow rapid, massive, structural set-up of Town Meetings and GWFs. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Preschool board of directors meets to discern next steps in registration. Lee, Bel and Park visit provincial Saemaul head and vice governor in relation to Project expansion.

Internal: Ecclesiola conversation and Daily Office witnesses on Dark Night impact House.

Contradiction: Finding a way to catalyze corporate planning and gathering the consensus of the village toward the future. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House experiences week of abounding opportunity as Song Chul accompanies Peace Corps survey of leper village community development possibilities. Korean Methodist church gives initial nod to grant of \$10,000 lot east of Seoul for training center, and head of 400,000 Methodist women indicates GWF interest.

Internal: Discomfort of two heatless days in freezing weather and frozen water pipes give way to warm greeting for back House checks and arrival of third ITT grant.

Contradiction: Deciding rather than wondering about how to loose the secret of history in an ancient society immersed in economic recreation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Three mountainside reservoirs tap springs and villagers complete two miles of meter deep ditch dug, piped and filled by hand to complete tap water system for every home in village—replacing 3,000 years of well system. First two sows litter—18 piglets at \$80 each for 400% return on investment. County picks village for subsidized herd of ten dairy cows with guaranteed milk contract and issues permit for grazing on 5,000 pyong pasture.

Internal: First Seoul office sojourner is shoehorned into corner room and househunting burner is turned up a notch as landlady gives quit premises notice—three times.

Contradiction: Torching bridges behind House while not knowing whether they may yet prove to be the way forward. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Framing of villages completes another significant step in Okinawa site selection. Another TM in Nagasaki in Roman Catholic Church is completed, with 25 people attending, and in Shimoseki the local Jaycees continue to catalyze TMs as another is set for next Sunday in Shimonoseki.

Internal: Mr. Tonasaki leaves for Hokkaido to attend his graduation ceremony and then go on to Tokyo.

Contradiction: Keeping the maneuver, HDP and the enlistment of new volunteers all moving. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: One very fine TM in Wakayama with Rotaracts (young Rotary) is done in Japanese. Two teams are in Tohoku Region for two weeks; another team is sent out to Shikoku Region for one week; and another team to nearby Nara Prefecture. On Saturday all teams have one Japanese bilingual person.

Internal: Three sojourners and many volunteers help to get all maneuvers going, and to make the Sol de Septiembre celebration Saturday night a great one.

Contradiction: Designing intentional blocks of time in order to complete tasks. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: House sends out troops to begin month-long maneuver for TM in Japan's "Northeast" district and completes logistical arrangements. Hiroshi Fukuyama participates in site selection of new Project in Okinawa.

Internal: House sends out Miss Hur Myung Hee after three months of global presence in Oyubari.

Contradiction: Changing lives rather than doing good deeds. (Wk. 13)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Development holds 21 visits, raising \$800 in hand and \$1,300 committed. In the mail money exceeds February bottom line and teams add another \$20,000 to the bottom line. Tour of the office files reveals dusty, but exciting, old CMA documents. Shire in the center of New South Wales is golded in great Aboriginal community meeting.

Internal: First issue of the *Juicy Grapevine* (area interchange) goes out.

Contradiction: Empowering the internal life of the Religious House and releasing significant corporate time to CMA push. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Training Consultation (CTC) floodgates open with first registration from Roman Catholic brother, followed closely by yeses from a young policeman and wife, a representative of the Macedonian community and a deserted wife with two kids.

Internal: Bumper month in income gets House into the black one month ahead of schedule, well on the way to getting extra \$1,000 by December 31st.

Contradiction: Releasing the regional wisdom to enable House to build models out over the abyss. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Visit to Premier's Department and Uniroyal Tire Company highlight week of breakthroughs in authorization and Development.

Internal: Kimberly Smith is inducted as student prefect at Adelaide High School.

Contradiction: Building on the advantages in South Australia to ensure a kick-start for a first-rate, top quality campaign. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Community Meeting Victoria enters final phase with 92 shires golded and 20 left to go. Team is sent to set up state campaign in Tasmania. Ross Trust donates \$2,500 for ongoing CMA funding.

Internal: Barry and Margaret Oakley celebrate 25th wedding anniversary at House Church with flowers, wine, gifts, telegrams and pavlovas.

Contradiction: Claiming learnings and victories of CMA: Victoria while launching the next state campaigns. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Dame Nancy Buttfield, past Minister for Immigration, says yes to being on National ICA Advisory Board. Banks calls from command post with 27 TMs in one week. Liz Banks returns from Bubun HDP, Indonesia, after health workshop with plans to meet Australian Development Assistance Bureau for Indonesian replication.

Internal: Hubert George Banks' death is celebrated in Kingston, South Australia, by all Banks family and John Rees representing Order from Adelaide.

Contradiction: Meeting House budget with one working and all others on the road. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Mobil Oil extends petrol credit for CMA treks and asks if they can talk with ICA about supporting community projects. Youth Club in Beaudesert calls to find out about program. Mailings go out for Phase II of CMA: Queensland.

Internal: House celebrates John Miesen's 30th birthday with pizza. Fence is constructed and garden planted.

Contradiction: Creating a do-able timeline for Phase II preparation that will release intensive engagement. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Two hundred mattress covers arrive as first sewing contract, whilst red-gum timber and galvanized pipe arrive for industries. Tables with seats attached form focal point in each stake for this week's meeting.

Internal: Modern electricity is connected to auxiliary house.

Contradiction: Revealing the relationship between humanness and the decision to pick up responsibility. (Wk. 13)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: *Nitijela* (legislature) scholarship committee says yes to funding two people to the Sudtonggan HDTs, although none meet the strict scholarship requirements, because they consider the training important.

Internal: House creates a two-year vision/tactical chart in the framework of what is required to be ready for the end of the US trusteeship and the beginning of a new nation in 1981.

Contradiction: Figuring out "how to shoot a tactic into a moving target". (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Wednesday hits bonanza with simultaneous visits from Department of Agriculture for demonstration of vegetable garden care, Department of Forestry with mini-saw mill demonstration, Department of Health with doctor and nurse and National Women's Committee.

Internal: House forces the evaluation of the time design and troop effectiveness by using local transportation.

Contradiction: Occasioning the village's decision to become the demonstration. (Wk. 13)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Guardians at San Jose and Sacramento enlist friends for evening presentation of the Richgrove HDP with local Richgrove residents telling the story.

Internal: Order Youth, Bruce Knowlton, does well-informed collegium on Argentina, impressing House with care for human geography.

Contradiction: Recognizing that sociological turf has got to be dealt with. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Guild meeting on Wednesday has 25 around the table. Sewer contract for step one EPA is finalized. Negotiations for Richgrove plaza site begin. Floor plan for plaza is completed.

Internal: House trailer arrives from Indiana Guardian and storage shed arrives from Oakland Guardian, expanding space possibilities to accommodate 17 House members.

Contradiction: Seeing the keystone as foundational to the beginnings of maturation. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: In Cusick, 20 people show up for the first Living Skills Institute (LSI) course and learn about physical fitness. Mayor Bob Bond acts the role of Dr. Lao which proves to be significant in the journey of Cusick.

Internal: The auxiliary goes on fast and broods over stance toward the world.

Contradiction: Sitting on antsiness and anxieties while maintaining focus on what needs to be done so Project doesn't come to complete stop. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: The eclipse happens as predicted with the culmination of maneuvers which include a week of four TMs, two CYFs, two ECFs, the printing of a new Northwest brochure, the send out of David Thomas and Alan Gammel to Maharashtra for a month and a great Movemental event with 40 present to view the new global film.

Internal: The Week II visit of the Panchayat is preceded by last-minute redecorating of new and old spaces and a week of guests in and out for forums and the Panchayat Visitation.

Contradiction: Catching up with the new advantage created and moving with it. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

Contradiction: Attacking with program when can hardly believe the breadth of possibility where local man is rising again. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: First week of actuation in acceleration phase has laundromat board deciding to expand inventory, and one-day housing workshop with architect, tribal planner and twelve residents.

Internal: House sends out Walt Epley to Wyoming for short-term permeation assignment.

Contradiction: Fulfilling equipment and materials needs beyond community resource capability. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: An Evening with the Institute allows the sharing of experiences of recent Consults with interested friends. Smoke alarm, fire extinguishers and vinyl tile are sent to Cusick day care center.

Internal: A study of the Declaration of the Spirit Movement at bi-weekly metro meetings builds common context.

Contradiction: Increasing the motivational level of the small core of metro colleagues in order to respond to needs of maneuvers, Development, etc. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: CYF proposal finished and submitted to Montana Youth Justice Council to do ten CYFs in Quarter II, brings brief moment of relaxation.

Internal: Early Spring weather melts 110-day snow cover and allows permeators to bicycle to work again.

Contradiction: Finding the doorway to the future hidden in self-support contradiction. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Two-hour Project evaluation session with all program staff ends with a great celebration. Joe Two Bear and Elmer Shelltrack are sent out to the Minto Consult. Auxiliary does an early morning plaza clean up miracle.

Contradiction: Applying the force which maintains the missional context in the programs. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Fine Community Youth Forum is held in Parkville at secondary school with David Woodbury taking full responsibility as orchestrator.

Internal: House sends out Michael and Elizabeth Neat to Minto Consult set-up team.

Contradiction: Finding wheels for the next month and then deciding about a car. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Tanana Chief's Conference donates time and

expertise for Consult. Sam Demetieff of Interior Villagers' Association is firm consultant. Three global slide shows are set up with key authorization and church for village adoption. Work weekend in village gets water, heating and electricity working in village Chief's (now auxiliary) house. House trailer and mobile kitchen trailer are inkinded for Consult.

Internal: Decor workday is a happening with four colleagues engaged full time and taking charge of work.

Contradiction: Coordinating and assessing needs with delivery in three locations. (Wk. 10).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Three meetings yield yes to saturation stronghold in urban neighborhood from community association president and commitment for CYF from Indian Metis Friendship Association.

Internal: Painting basement cement walls transforms collegium room.

Contradiction: Moving fast enough to capitalize on what's going. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Village readiness is seen in interest in potential laundromat.

Internal: March snow storm isolates auxiliary occasioning shoveling of 400 feet of driveway.

Contradiction: Adjusting auxiliary role to enable community new readiness to take initiative. (Wk. 13)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Deep in the Heart of Texas Maneuver results in seven events held and seven more scheduled. GWF with Houston Professional Women is set for May and GWF is scheduled for March 17th with 30 invited by core of colleagues who decide to push GWF. Seven possible LENS are uncovered in Pivotal City arenas.

Internal: David Rose is selected as National Merit Finalist with letter of commendation to his Guardians. Houston House youth host 20 friends for an evening cabaret and dance party. Larry Henschen creates opportunity to upgrade job by interplant transfer.

Contradiction: Choosing the key possibility in the midst of a near avalanche of possibilities. (Wk. 12)

Contradiction: Solidifying the meeting patterns of the leadership core in preparation for the first year celebration. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Bakery pilot project shows that *bunelas* will sell locally—next step is expanding regular markets. Thirty-five attend GWF sponsored by GWF grads and Our Lady at the Lake University; six San Antonio ladies serve as workshop leaders. Thirty-eight people attend GED registration meeting. Internal: House shrinks as Shelly Reese is sent out for a week of CYF orchestration in eastern Oregon, and Roger Marsh returns to Indianhoma saturation maneuver.

Contradiction: Clarifying total intent of saturation maneuvers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Staff helps complete Indianhoma Maneuver and launches Denton Maneuver with seven events set up in first week. Global film preview event has 25 patrons and Guardians with McMurray Foundation director, Buick District manager and Director of Personnel of the Dallas ISD for the first time. Week of major funding and donors makes 12 visits with in-hand of \$1125.

Internal: House plans Quarter IV and prepares for Area Council.

Contradiction: Utilizing all colleagues and contacts in the 1001 tasks at hand. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Eight TMs and two assemblies are held. Since October, a total of 76 TMs have been held with 3,400 participants. House projects .5 percent of the population will be impacted by the end of April with .5 percent of the adult population having already been reached. Regional TM (assembly) format is tested twice with great excitement. Delta Pace holds two-year vision and plans for second Consult toward next two years and expansion.

Internal: Bertha Pinkston, D. Scott, R. Williams and K. Lush visit for Pace TM participation and TM: Mississippi.

Contradiction: Maintaining one corporate thrust through two campaigns and three Houses, as intensity makes authentic and informed consensus difficult. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: House prepares for Area Council by inking motel rooms, meals and facility while holding a CYF in Alexander for leaders from four high schools all of whom say yes to leading future CYFs.

Internal: House Church is attended by great colleagues who stay for planning meetings for Area Council, Regional Council, two TMs, and preparing New Orleans troops for India in June.

Contradiction: Discerning the spirit contradiction which Area Council must effectively remove. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: First three North Delta TMs are held with average of 50 in attendance, being good demonstrations to the more nervous towns. Majority of the 20 are in the chute for March. Development reports Owen Cooper, Yazoo City, Mississippi, citizen, returns from Maharashtra visit with video tape and film made of village work to present to Southern Baptist committee which releases \$1500 for India.

Internal: With the North Delta Maneuver operating out of Memphis, all are given a chance to join in collegiums, an evening meal and night on the town as well as TMs.

Contradiction: Pushing learnings of Mississippi to build potential in Memphis while giving 100% to Mississippi. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Regional trek winds down with last two stops in Americus and Charleston. Film proves to have dramatic impact on audiences. Grovetown holds TM and second Imaginal Education course held in Eastlake, positioning House for major increase in impact events in Augusta and South Dekalb.

Contradiction: Positioning Candler/Glenwood saturation for a major win to launch Quarter IV with a bang. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Gibson community accelerates activities as guilds scatter in myriad directions to make significant accomplishments including first regional metro trek and major inkind of chain link fencing and prefabricated building.

Internal: House experiences self as punch bowl, celebrating return of Dave Hutcheons from HDTs and visit of Barbara Scott and Betty Lerves.

Contradiction: Gathering the scattered Project activities. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Lagging spirits are revived in the unexpected excitement of a set-up meeting for a neighborhood forum.

Internal: The arrival of Lent and the *Daily Directions for the Celebration of Lent '79* fills House with gratitude for Church year and colleagues.

Contradiction: Maintaining the comprehensive context for task over against particularizing possibilities within structures of local church. (Wk. 10)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Nexus hosts 175 guests, many for the first time, to Evening at the Institute and presents the global film. Schedule conflicts across the continent cause frantic search for RS-I first teacher. Team is sent to Lima for site selection. Inkind post obtains carpeting for entire sixth floor corridor.

Internal: Image of stunning excellence reigns during Panchayat Visitation to the nexus.

Contradiction: Getting wheels under quarter's North American maneuvers and clarity on specifics of the nexus' role. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Fifth City community members volunteer to supervise recreational activities at the gymnasium. Fifth City Voice is ready for distribution with students' drawings on snow from Leif Erickson School and front page photo of HDTs grads.

Internal: House receives Panchayat Visitation which ends in celebration Sunday evening at the Serbian Club.

Contradiction: Making transition into Quarter IV with celebrations while actions are tied to closing out and continuing to end Quarter III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP

External: Image of "Spring Express" is key to publicity for March 19 community assembly. Assembly publicity is launched. Advanced first aid training is scheduled. TM is held in Granger with 90 participants.

Internal: House makes agreement for new and larger living facility rent-free for three years.

Contradiction: Cementing the images of Quarter IV assembly to long range. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Strongholds for Quarter IV are selected, maneuvers delineated, and first mailing piece designed.

Internal: Ecclesiola turns out to be a surprise maneuver to the local bowling alley, enabling metro teams to organize themselves for quick victory.

Contradiction: Seeing everything is done as one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: South Dakota is visited again for the first time since the Yellow Country Days. All 18 towns visited have not missed a beat since the community gathered a year ago. Internal: Jim Slotta and Mary Ann Wainwright offer different perspectives doing guest collegiums during week.

Contradiction: Doing the mission with troops available only Day I and Day II. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Elders meal program reaches all-time high with 35 people participating in birthday party and first entertainment. Scheduling of entertainment is start of expanding into cultural events.

Internal: House sends McCabes to Minto Consult.

Contradiction: Finding a way to involve the community in planning and executing miracle events. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Kinney/Great Scott Community Association (LEV) is incorporated, linking city and township. Extension holds vegetable garden workshop. Women's industry team models sample uniform for designer in Minneapolis. City Council gives go ahead to developer to do 13 units of senior citizen housing.

Internal: Auxiliary families enjoy area fish fry, dance and card party over weekend.

Contradiction: Re-engaging symbolic leadership of town. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Ticket sellers are commissioned for the regional premiere of the global film at the "International Evening" on March 31.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat Visitation climaxed by 35 colleagues attending buffet and global catch-up.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the troops to do the work of the region. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: House sets up 13 TMs in Parkhill area of Louisville. The first one is held at St. Ann's Roman Catholic church with 100 adults and 60 children. Next step is taken in securing strong support for large proposal to "Venture in Mission" program of the Episcopal church here in Indianapolis. First CYF in the bi-metro is a fantastic event with 80 participants at Tech High school in Indianapolis, the state's largest secondary school.

Internal: House sends out David and Jackie Speicher to Minto Consult leadership. Tax refunds return to boost self-support another \$1100.

Contradiction: Engaging new metro colleagues in campaigns and necessary back-up systems. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Program self-support is becoming a trend as checks come in from Columbus CYF, Hamilton YMCA training event, and the next two TMs are fully funded in advance.

Internal: Cluster Youth initiates new "glue" assignment by calling circuiters every day at 6:00 pm to interchange data.

Contradiction: Articulating the historical necessity of every event in order to release revolutionary passion for detailed implementaries. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Region shows HDP slide show to post TM guilds in three northern communities and sees global film at Regional Council.

Internal: House takes advantage of northern circuit to do cross-country skiing and celebrates life and death of Gregg Harris' father.

Contradiction: Setting the stage for the next major offensive. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The Wauseon Waltz forges ahead with the completion of Phase I by recruiting three Paulding Co. coordinators for the upcoming TM assembly. Philippe King, HDTs grad, hosts an evening on "The Values of Involvement" as his self-support drive kickoff event.

Internal: House is nurtured by week-long visit by Julia Hahn and evening visit by Allison Batchelor and friends.

Contradiction: Hanging on to your packages while the revolving door is spinning. (Wk. 13)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Series of events in Smithtown are winning out Those Who Care. The picture of the two party leaders signing the Smithtown Unity Planning Effort and Results (SUPER) Month Proclamation in the Long Island edition of the *Daily News* create the public symbol.

Internal: Evening conversations occasion profound collegial reflection through topics of releasing creativity and readings of *Future Shock*.

Contradiction: Keeping the corporate body up with required shifting rhythm. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Date set in Valencia for TM—first last year in Butler County and first this year, with comment, "This year we want to get everybody out."

Internal: With procurement of one more job, balance promises to be black in June.

Contradiction: Maximizing the effectiveness of on-the-turf time in enabling decisions now. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Panchayat Visitation provides opportunity for contextualizing colleagues on global mission and missional force needs. Colleagues see Coggeshall's India slides on Saturday and global film on Sunday.

Internal: Panchayat Visitation ends in celebration with pizza and roller skating. Elaine Butcher is selected as senior class candidate for Recognition Week queen.

Contradiction: Grounding the fact that House is a part of a world-wide campaign, not a relative of one. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Neighborhood Meeting: DC comes alive as Stake III MM attracts new faces and sends out two to orchestrate Harrisburg TM of 125. The Ivy City Corporation comes alive as it commits itself to obtaining lease for the Greyline Building and raising \$50,000 venture capital.

Internal: The task of creating the format for the Regional Council allows fantastic collegium where all is possible is the rubric.

Contradiction: Interweaving maneuvers to form a solid consensus that allows the corporate body to move. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Snack Bar opens in Widen Gym, run by personnel from the Widen Youth Corps (CETA). Contributions come alive as two churches secure new portable toilets for the preschool.

Internal: Water runs where it is supposed to—in and out.

Contradiction: Carving out time for long-term planning and consensus building in the midst of doing the immediacies. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: A training event for ten in a Harrisburg neighborhood in November occasions the Central Allison Hill TM with 140 in attendance with a high-spirited evening.

Internal: The *Alternatives* study on India reveals new insights about the role of human rights.

Contradiction: Locating the responsive networks that will do and pay for numbers of impact events. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: A fund raising dinner is held for nutritionists with a report on India from Dr. Janice Dodds. Money is raised and a frame created.

Internal: Chairs are inked from Airco through a contact from a metro colleague.

Contradiction: Undergirding corporate times to brood through next actions. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: The gala reception for the Panchayat Visitation team is attended by metro and local Guardians and friends. Chapter One of *Starks History* has a phenomenal sale. The woodshop's imminent opening is enabled by the promise of a coinciding visit of two Guardians with equipment and know-how.

Internal: Sprucing up the farmhouse for the Panchayat visit provides a welcome respite and three days of reflection, reporting and celebrating renew the auxiliary's grasp of the comprehensive and set future directions.

Contradiction: Imaging and prioritizing do-ment while at the same time honoring the town's vote. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Week of Panchayat Visitation catalyzes evenings with Charlotteville core and Albany and Binghamton metros. Colleagues whom House has not seen for some time reappear.

Internal: Future directions spin with Panchayat leads to animated discussion of future directions and interactions of HDP, TM and region.

Contradiction: Winning with the firewood industry quickly in the face of accelerating opposition while enabling the community to take responsibility. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Four dates for TMs set in Brockton and Laconia strongholds. High school assigns metro student to Minto, Alaska out of careers program.

Internal: House celebrates Ahren Stock's first birthday and continues review of basic methods with charting method study.

Contradiction: Maintaining the intensity of the stronghold in the midst of planning regional and area councils. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: House participates in the "Great Week of Regional Swirls" with area newsletters sent to three other regional Houses, 360 newsletters mailed to colleagues in Montreal and Quebec and a regional framing collegium which targets 25 colleagues for nurture and assignment.

Internal: With eyes on the global mission through sneak preview of global film, House focuses on Open House preparations, installing commercial in-kind carpet while sending three from the House to Ontario Saturation and Minto Consult, achieving highest week yet in self-support, and sustaining youth on a term paper typing marathon.

Contradiction: Refocusing the mission to allow the journey of much-needed, new colleagues. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: An advertising and printing company changes layout of CFC county coverage brochure into a masterpiece and will print 7,000 on company-provided paper, while another company will print 2,000 Canadian ICA brochures. The mailing of letters and area newsletter, *The Eastern Scan*, complete a week of mass mailing.

Internal: Basement is cleaned up after sewer collapse floods it.

Contradiction: Allowing corporate planning to weave individual tasks into a focused victory. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Portland forum kicks off North Leeds Development days. Sudbury committee decides on 15 forums for April. Multi-cultural youth action forum in Thunder Bay proposes cross-community student exchange program.

Internal: Feverish preparation of new forum workbook causes strange and unearthly time design.

Contradiction: Refining saturation strategy to produce crowds as well as events. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Development trips net \$1200 cash and \$30,000 in loan from a religious order. Saturation assists with 500-person event that came from Community Forum proposal. New weekly rhythm in LEDC office includes methods training. Adult education classes begin new sessions using *Alternatives* and *Campaign News* for conversations. *Voice* is produced and distributed, arranged by Youth editor, Humel LaPointe.

Internal: Permeation team locates three job offers over \$12,000, all four to six hours away and accepts one.

Contradiction: Giving priority time to critical proposal-writing in the maneuver plan. (Wk. 13)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Clearing playfield with tractor precipitates self-generated workday by youth, who have played baseball every afternoon since.

Internal: Mr. Dethe is sent out by community and auxiliary during community assembly.

Contradiction: Releasing and maintaining auxiliary excitement regarding the power of sector TMs in order to enable community excitement and participation. (Wk. 13)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Two local greenhouse employees chosen by the community start work on the construction at the four greenhouses and begin planting zucchini squash. The sewing industry workers receive salaries for work on school uniforms. Fourteen women attend a 36-hour first aid class two days a week. The GWF team arrives and plunges into preparations for the Forum in Santiago.

Internal: Participating in the home spruce up campaign by sector, the auxiliary digs the black muck out of their septic hole, nicknamed "The Dark Abyss".

Contradiction: Making long-range decisions which have significant consequences beyond the vision. (Wk. 13)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: The week begins sending Campbell to Peru for site selection and ends with arrival of Mr. Dethe to design community center. Regional Director of state electrical company and two engineers visit Bananeiras 24 hours after first contact and promise to find the most effective and quickest means to close 24 km. gap. Roman Catholic Bishop Dom Jose makes first visit with ten youth and promises to tell Bananeiras story as witness to ITI methods at next week's regional meeting of 14 bishops and the Cardinal. Fourth and fifth GWFs are set in two new key cities for trek team in Week 12. ITI visit with Methodist bishop produces phone call to his old friend, the head of immigration, to clear visa issues. Auxiliary member, Lionel Oliveira, leads team to San Jose on first Foro set up trek. Two-hour visit with Director of Caritas, one of TWC, opens up Roman Catholic funding possibilities. Eight Bananeiras youth show up in uniforms for the first day of school in Silva Jardim, the first time ever anyone in Bananeiras had attended the fifth grade. At most exciting community meeting to date, five male leaders attend to plan agribusiness development.

Internal: The arrival of Lenten construct puts new spirit into Daily Office witnesses. Youth collegium on forging models for completion of correspondence courses produces new corporate resolve to win on cluster experiment.

Contradiction: Constantly seeking new death ground from which to discover the Lord's bountifulness. (Wk. 13)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: The preschool visits Moy Hall coffee factory during industry curriculum, gets free pony rides and inkind food for hot lunches.

Internal: The Lockmans and Fosters from Bellingham, Washington, arrive for ten days and plug into health, construction and stakes.

Contradiction: Unblocking industry contractors to keep pace with the village. (Wk. 9)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: One hundred twenty-five women attend first GWF in Conacaste.

Internal: House sends out the Castro family to visit other Latin American projects after a week of sojourning here.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the irrigation project to actualize the dream now planted in the minds of Conacaste farmers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: House makes 16 authorization calls including meetings with the Ministry of Agriculture, National Institute of Planning, Inter-American Development Bank and the US Ambassador, as well as four site selection trips. A grad meeting/slide show is held with 13 participants.

Internal: House is temporarily established at the Maryknoll Communications Center, celebrates Jon's birthday at dinner and has a lunch of national dishes at the beach with the metro cadre core.

Contradiction: Clarifying the structure of the government and ensuring that nod is high enough. (Wk. 13)

WEEK THIRTEEN

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a week of US foundation gifts ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000. Freedom from Hunger proposal for Serusup is sent to Brussels. Guardian luncheon in Manila is attended by major supporters, highlighted by a talk from Deputy Minister Marquez from the Ministry of Local Government and Community Development. Corporations take active role in both funding and personnel throughout the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building momentum for cash in hand while placing emphasis on base of support for all programs.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports in-the-field research as the Hong Kong Nexus participates in 105 GCFs on Mactan Island, and a methods training module refinement is given its fourth run in Bontoa. The Panchayat Visitation to the Chicago Nexus occasions reflection on the future of impact and demonstration in North America and on emerging images of the Global Servant Force. Reports on the power of the global film as an impact and authorization tool comes in as copies return from Africa and from across North America. Images for the GRA in Chicago in July begin to emerge. A proposal is written for an assembly drawing together the learnings from two decades of experiments in human development by a broad range of agencies including the ICA. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding the large images and refining the tools needed to catapult the Movement into a new orbit for Quarter IV and the coming year.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the Loudermilks complete four LENS seminars in Nairobi and one in Lagos. LENS is also scheduled with Royal Trust Company, one of Canada's largest banks. GSD strike forces move with strength in Asherton and Mill Shoals HDPs. Booher returns from European continental council. Campaign convergence takes practical form as the continent prepares to pull together behind North American 19 with impact, acceleration and Guardian support. The key contradiction lies in the arena of providing clear images to the continent that reveal urgency and give practical focus to engagement.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports on the start of the audit in Chicago and the receipt of sufficient inkind carpet to do all the sixth floor halls. Hong Kong initiates the search for a new facility and mails out the February Order Ecumenical reports. Singapore moves ahead on the Malaysia audit and Brussels and India match up data for grant documentation. ICA general ledgers are being opened for 1979 at all locations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unclarity on the bottom line products for this quarter which skews operating priorities.
