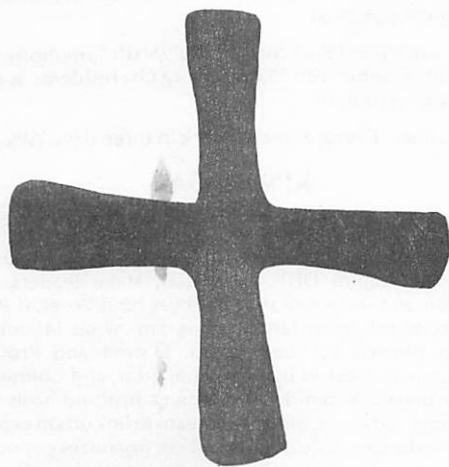

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: House travels to Manchester for Area Council. Reports are presented on three years of Isle of Dogs HDP and CYF as part of Town Meeting campaign. Polis coverage campaign is launched anew as area wide circuit begins.

Internal: Six House members go on area maneuver and 18 German students spend three days at House.

Contradiction: Setting up adequate system for polis coverage with TM. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Community worker phones in requesting a Town Meeting signalling another polis ready. House car and driver go to Manchester for area maneuvers while map and materials are prepared for upcoming Scotland blitz.

Internal: Paul Dyhr's company sends official appeal to secure a work permit.

Contradiction: Covering the polises quickly, yet leaving a base for future phases. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TA'RGWAITH HDP

External: Beautiful Easter sunshine creates mood of new hopefulness and catalyzes the start of work on building foundations, community rugby game, packed hall for carnival queen dance, and painting of benches in the park.

Internal: Spring cleaning raises spirits and produces a large pile of rubbish, a new garden and an inventory of inkind paint.

Contradiction: Instilling courage in the reliable, down to earth leadership to make the corporate leap to the impossible "doing." (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Lucy Smith is sent out with four metro colleagues from three metros to continental Guardians Meeting.

Internal: House participates in parish church's (St. James) Centenary Thanksgiving service, with Guardian, Bishop Wickham, giving the address.

Contradiction: Seeing through methods to completing U.K. polis coverage by Week 9. (Wk. 2)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Polis coverage is completed as 35 Community Forums are done in three weeks to finish France's 72 polises. Debriefing to record the learnings and strategizing how to move next into Area Frankfurt, Area London, and Area Brussels end the campaign. In the midst of struggling to decide where French speakers need to move next, Monique LeGuillou receives assignment to Lima, Peru.

Internal: Supper club, dancing, drinks and grilling steaks in the garden for the final celebration of the France campaign finds 21 people from across the European continent celebrating 72 finished polises and a new-found collegial power.

Contradiction: Consolidating the French campaign while keeping the momentum going in the remaining European nations. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: The inauguration of the industrial building goes off in incredible Italian style. The Mayor of Cagnano in official sash cuts the ribbon. The priest in his stole blesses the building machinery and workers. All give speeches in honor of the occasion. Champagne and cakes from the cooperative are consumed. A tired ICA auxiliary stands in the shadows while local man celebrates. At the fiesta following, everyone dances until midnight.

Internal: The fearless four (the fifth is doing TMs in France) eat, reflect, and plan during hectic intensive building prep.

Contradiction: Nurturing the Week II Italian colleagues while beckoning the full-time revolutionaries. (Wk. 5)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Marathon management meeting and 15-strong community planning days symbolize emerging community iron, while news of ink drums and borehole from Lever Brothers and Taylor Woodrow are received with glee. Larentis technical truck arrives and eight sweaty hours later streetlights blaze into life again after Lenten pause. CIDA site visit impacts Director with Project seriousness.

Internal: A week of glorious victory is celebrated on the occasion of an auxiliary birthday with fabulous Chinese feast at Mr. K. P. Yu's house in the Nichemtex compound, and a romp in his swimming pool.

Contradiction: Setting arenas of responsibility concretely on the shoulders of leaders and employees. (Wk. 5)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus rides to a whirlwind finish with the Diamond Hexagon Campaign for Town Meeting in France.

Internal: Week II conversations on the mythology of the 20th Century zero in on the relevancy of the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Using the advantage of the corporate to enable the task effectively. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House sets up 12 TMs, does four, launches a stronghold, breaks open crucial Church and political authorization in Wallonia in first on-the-road week of the Benelux Waltz.

Internal: Mini-celebrations and nightly remaneuvering sustain the week.

Contradiction: Structuring continental accountability and communications for one polis coverage campaign in three areas. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House participates in continental GCF remaneuvering in Paris and discovers colleagues do Daily Office themselves while House is away at Guardians meeting. Colleague calls to say he has received 15-page report and 64 slides from Kapini for Development. House sets date for advisory board meeting for *Dorpsdag* to be gunned by board member. Area Council creates new Benelux song.

Internal: Easter discontinuity sees whole House at Brussels Grand Place.

Contradiction: Demonstrating any number of people can be a Religious House if they decide to. (Wk. 5)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Three vehicles head north for the Hannover Hustle (Phase I on the Great German Gamble) after a four-day respite of maneuver building highlighted by readings from *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*. When women's group of a local church declines the opportunity, pastor takes team into psychiatric hospital for first *Gemeindeforum* within that heretofore un-dreamed-of network.

Internal: New decor embracing the Hannover Hustle, the Munich Monopoly, and the Stuttgart Shuffle brightens the office with pool tables, deed cards and four aces.

Contradiction: Creating the offers that cannot be refused which will allow volunteers to step forward to man the Volkswagens and control center. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: The largest *Haustreffen* (House Town Meeting) occurs as 27 tenants in *Wrangelstrasse* meet to plan the future of their building, whose new owner, Willi Peik, is building a cooperative renovation model with assistance from the Project. The *Berlin Tages-Spiegel* prints an article about the Project, "The Momentum of the Invigorated Citizens Carries on into the Third Year", which results in an immediate donation of a microwave oven to the *Cafe zur Laterne*, as well as tremendous authorization potential.

Internal: House enjoys Tchaikowsky's Sixth Symphony at the Berlin Philharmonic with 15 Kreuzberg Ost residents as guests of the city government.

Contradiction: Doing a week's work in three days. (Wk. 3)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Knowing that agriculture is the key to tripling the income, the Kapini HDP Secretariat, stake leaders, Farm Association and demonstration farmers hold Week II PSU to map out comprehensive farming programs, while 14 additional acres are plowed for bean crop. District and Provincial authorization is secured by Mukosha, prior, and Chimwanga, Project manager. Kapini HDP Women's Institute hosts tea in Lusaka with Guardian women as a means to link urban expertise with new industries. Social Commission organizes community to repair preschool building, while caretakers distribute vitamin-protein supplements to malnourished children.

Internal: Wes Lachman returns from Development trip with steel for two new soil-cement brick machines and K3,000 for primary school.

Contradiction: Clarifying the real death ground, not just important worries. (Wk. 10)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water gushing forth from *hanafeyas* (public water taps) in all six stakes drowns images of impossibility while the first complete toilet and shower block is opened for public use in the center of the village.

Internal: Presence of the Greg Farley family of four necessitates creation of a dorm for children who begin to impact the village through participation in preschool lesson planning and Arabic lessons.

Contradiction: Discerning the next peak to climb that will beckon village motivation now that water is accessible to every home. (Wk. 5)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Final week of prep for HDTS begins as Zambian and Nigerian colleagues arrive to plug into huge task of construction and set-up. Recruitment continues in Kawangware, Kamweleni and particularly in the rest of Machakos District following up Village Meetings. Approximately US\$3,500 comes in from LENS seminars and enables tight cash flow. Two new facilities arise as if from the dust as first building is completed in just two days.

Internal: Family check enables Nairobi House and other staff, who arrived early to set-up school, to celebrate in grand style with meal and dancing at the Nairobi Hotel.

Contradiction: Creating support structures that keep the cash-in-hand coming in that will allow the HDTS to move with power. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP**

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

**BOMBAY**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

**DELHI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

**MADRAS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

**CALCUTTA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTs which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

**SINGAPORE**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Nexus gets ready for Panchayat visit with Singapore colleagues eagerly participating in planning Movement event.

Internal: This is a week of visitors: Stephen Leenhouts, Stan Gibson, Robert and Shirley Porter, Danaraj Darlington, David Thomas, Scott Morris, James Chia—all experiencing the "Singapore Sling."

Contradiction: Pushing through the continuum versus "on the road" tension toward a one nexus focused on one zone mindset. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: University of Technology Malaysia students are brought to Serusup HDP by district officer as only exhibition of district's three demonstration villages. Serusup Handicrafts wins first, second and third prize at district fair. Datuk Harris, Chief Minister, compliments Project and project global market for economic programs. Village company is formed with Board of Directors of one representative from each guild and each space chosen at community meeting. Two international economics consultants learn about Project.

Internal: House undergoes massive renovation after receiving first full program check of Project.

Contradiction: Recreating neglected community space. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI HDP**

External: HDP meeting space is remodeled and has a new large conference table around which to meet for three nights of very exciting quarter planning with an average of 18 villagers around the table and quick, expert translation executed by a relative newcomer to the village who jumps right in with a 1,000 chicken farm and tutorials for school children every day. The planning itself is like being on a roller-coaster with every dead horse coming back to life for a new kick and the complexity of new issues being a fight to the death producing an occasional stand-up oration. For the second series next week, 30 formal invitations are hand delivered.

Internal: Robert and Shirley Porter help with Development systems and share the latest thinking on global systems, and Shirley leaves with a Tai silk flower corsage from the ladies' new industry.

Contradiction: Recreating village self story which heals roots of tribal division. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: New Camat district officer makes Kelapa Dua his first official visit, indicating a new decision by the local government to adopt the Project. Development push gets underway with \$1,950 in hand received this week.

Internal: Lynda Cock's brother visits and gives dental demonstration for preschool children.

Contradiction: Deciding steps in response to door opened by Camat's visit. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: Quarterly community assembly determines priorities for year and quarter and is planned and carried out by villagers. Two teams in blue sail off in Project boat to do two more GCFs returning for midnight dinner and reflection. Fishermen's cooperative begins to enable marketing and supplies. Health clinic provides mass inoculation against cholera through the primary schools and "an afternoon at the clinic". Faculty forum representing three universities in Medan is new ground for broadening Movement participation. Community celebrates the completed life of Mr. Umar, community fisherman.

Internal: Joni is sent back to Serusup, and West to Jakarta for USAID finances and Development.

Contradiction: Transferring effectively major responsibility of GCF and program follow-up to community structures. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: *Sidang Masyarakat* (Community Assembly) is held in Bontoa to celebrate its first six months. It is a great occasion with 130 adults present. The preparation occasions the painting of the community center, the building of bamboo fences around every house, cementing the community kitchen, and total community kitchen. Andi Abdid Lathief, chairman of South Sulawesi Parliament, gives the opening address. Commissioning of 26 TM leaders, five health caretakers and three preschool teachers, five guild leaders and the cooperative officers emphasizes the emerging leadership of Bontoa. A representative from the bank presents repair shop with the village's first loan. Three villagers plus political heads of all five levels of local government attend the signing of the Plan of Cooperation between ICA and the government of South Sulawesi assuring Bontoa of 44,000 from the province in the next four years.

Internal: Five villagers attend ecclesiola and participate fully.

Contradiction: Creating structures to use newly gained workshop skills in planning practical action.

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Development raises US\$18,000 in Manila. Staff are sent to Korea, Taiwan, the Philippines and Hong Kong.

Internal: Four-day Easter holiday enables health claim update and completion of ICA monthly report, in the midst of participating in the canonical hours.

Contradiction: Building the models that enable doing the on-going tasks while finding a new facility. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Cupboard and air conditioner are donated to dental clinic. Parents attend Easter holiday session of primary guidance group and youth group begin the next newsletter with almost no prompting. The last major landholders come back from Europe's Chinese restaurants to sell their land to the Nam Wai Foundation, and the chairman prepares travel documents for Chicago visit. Another social service agency confirms forum date for their staff.

Internal: Clare Bonnell returns with encouraging reports of Philippine clusters after visiting all three regions with Hong Kong Guardian and Panchayat team.

Contradiction: Shifting the village's self image to Phase III while continuing thrusts in Development and turning Hong Kong gold. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Guardian meeting in Taipei discusses Hai Ou's future economic development. Crabs and prawn fry are sold with US\$3,000 profit.

Internal: House celebrates with dinner and a movie in Kaohsiung as quarter planning recreates House structure.

Contradiction: Building models that allow new construction and business expansion to be funded. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: House celebrates week of diplomatic conversations with three embassies: Mrs. Berkley Bedell introduces U. S. Ambassador Murphy to staff and work of ICA while board members make introductions to Singapore Ambassador Baker and Phillip Brothers. Guardian takes first secretary of Dutch Embassy to Sudtonggan (resulting in Dutch commitment of 40,000 pesos). Security and Exchange and Internal Revenue reports for Philippines 1978 are submitted.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat Visitation during which Board and Guardians see global film.

Contradiction: Integrating the programs into one creative thrust for a nation. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: During Week 2, Development banks US\$2,500, bringing Quarter IV total (first two weeks) to US\$5,638. Cabinet Minister agrees to assist Development effort by raising half of funds needed for the new community center facility in Hai Ou.

Internal: First ecclesiola of Quarter IV during Holy Week, and Easter vigil workday prepare House for great Easter morning House Church feast.

Contradiction: Delivering Guardian support to the task of creating the local economic vehicle for Hai Ou while covering all maneuver arenas simultaneously. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Second Sudtonggan Human Development Training School begins with 34 participants and staff of 22, doubling the size of first school. Staff arrives from Kenya, Indonesia, Malaysia and the United States with new building finished. Suba Panas, San Miguel, Malingin, and Baska Mercado guilds plan huge economic fair to cap April economic intensification. House welcomes back Project director, Ching On, from Hong Kong and sends out Carl Hickey as staff move.

Internal: Panchayat is big hit of the week as they show global film to 500 villagers and HDTS students.

Contradiction: Sorting out the chaos which confuses the great leap. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Mountain cluster begins to move as four community forums are held in two days in maneuver for HDTs recruitment and Consult preparation. Twenty-three troops from Langub walk 40 kilometers in two days to participate and lead those forums with a total participation of 408. Long-awaited water pump for accessible community water begins installation and pushes water 180 feet uphill. City engineer's office assigns truck to assist Langub Brick Factory and eight truckloads of adobe stone for the kiln are delivered in one day. Possibility of huge contracts for sewing draws closer as new export-minded buyer orders garments for samples.

Internal: Ken and Judy Hamje arrive to shake the mountain into action and walk over 100 kilometers doing set-up for forums.

Contradiction: Increasing momentum of Langub programs in midst of HDTs recruitment and turning over of the baton. (Wk. 2)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Circuits cover two new prefectures in the Kanto Maneuver. Mitsui Shipbuilding Company sends two representatives to ICA office to discuss the arrangements for Town Meeting sponsorship.

Internal: David Thomas from Seattle visits for two days with news from India and Southeast Asia.

Contradiction: Securing regular and scheduled volunteers for circuit teams. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Villagers install new grain mill equipment and reactivate services of the old mill while the common mill is made operational. Arbor Day is great event throughout the island with hundreds of thousands of trees planted.

Internal: Two new English classes move self-support into the black, beginning with April.

Contradiction: Continuing focus on struggle to open the common grain mill while also providing comprehensive care for Project and impact on island. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Extensive inkind network is engaged from paint to Crown Beer in preparation for one year celebration at Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Law office permeator's income is boosted by more than half to monthly net of US\$1,650, exceeding total House budget by 25%.

Contradiction: Having only one free finger while three buttons need pushing. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Visit to county chief reveals abundant Project praise, \$6,000 commitment for village truck, assurances of phones and 20 new homes, and his intent to forward special report commending the Project to President Park this fall.

Internal: School enrollment of Park children contains outward-bound dimension as it involves three mile daily hike over the mountain.

Contradiction: Allowing Project celebration plans and needs to enhance rather than foreclose fullness of the multitude of spring tasks in a rural village. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: A visit to Kumamoto bears gold as Kumamoto Prefecture is on its way to being gold. Two TMs are set and one more is possible, with aid from three CYF grads from Kumamoto University. House also holds meeting with Dazaifu Lions Club about TM.

Internal: House revitalizes symbolic life during Holy Week with nightly Psalm reading as well as marking Maundy Thursday with special dinner.

Contradiction: Meshing the gears for effective coordination of upcoming key events. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Marugame JayCees on Shikoku Island call in to ICA office and set Town Meeting date for June 9th. Printing is inked for first national newsletter. Maundy Thursday is a great regional event with 15 Japanese colleagues present at the celebrational meal.

Internal: House hosts David Thomas en route from India and Holy Week observances and celebrations are great happening for the whole House.

Contradiction: Shifting to story of Quarter IV victory and concretizing strategies for final push. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: Town Meeting training event is held for Hokkaido circuiters. Monthly events in Oyubari are planned through April.

Internal: Mr. Fukuyama Hiroshi announces his decision to take new full-time job with the Christian Academy.

Contradiction: Sustaining motivation when things appear lame duck. (Wk. 5)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: CMA possibilities continue to be explored as letters go out to provincial Sisters of Mercy in New South Wales and House is invited to do a two page article for the Local Government Association Bulletin. Day 1 colleague meeting turns into half day event as several folks drop in for a bite of lunch and missional chat.

Internal: Easter weekend is celebrated with work (retiling kitchen floor, reclaiming vegie garden), canonical hours, church attendance, seeing the film *Black Orpheus* and feasting.

Contradiction: Moving with power in a shifting universe. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Panchayat visit brings together old and new colleagues for a great film night, reignites local Guardian support and elicits referral for Salani from Samoan clergyman.

Internal: Miracles performed by local colleagues as they invite guests, prepare the House and fill the fridge with food, in readiness for the Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Demonstrating the presence of the Perth House while troops are deployed on other fronts. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP**

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Momentum of region is high as South Australian Community Meeting campaign is launched and finding flexibility in doing short-term, four-week campaign. Ten meetings held in Week 13 are highlighted in a great meeting at Kingston.

Internal: Twelve additional troops swell House and first week celebration is spontaneous and relaxed fun.

Contradiction: Making the campaign a series of spirit maneuvers instead of one long campaign. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Victoria is GOLD! One hundred twelve Community Meetings are held, one in each shire with 601 total attendance. Five shires have already invited House back to conduct larger public meetings and evaluation targets seven shires to launch saturation. Borg-Warner and Alcoa request CMs in their company towns.

Internal: Final CM celebration is inked from first class local hotel engaging everyone from 4 to 66 years in a fantastic evening of feasting and dancing.

Contradiction: Marshalling and training the regional troops to do the next phase of the campaigns. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: Guardians Sir Roger Darvall and Peter Derham from private sector, Melbourne, and Dr. Cyril Evans, Federal Deputy Director of Health, clarify objectives to ICA allowing Minister Hunt to give ICA faculty at Murrin Bridge a direct grant—the first direct public sector grant in Australia.

Contradiction: Keeping all acts going while half the magicians disappear. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: Preschool opens, 8:00 to 3:00 five days a week, with 17 students and four full-time staff. State licensing inspector comments, "This is the fastest licensing process I've ever been involved in and with all those calls from Representative Duffy's office, you've really got strong support."

Internal: Visiting Redlands youth group joins House, after a hard day's work, in evening of games and relaxation.

Contradiction: Pushing aside activities and making time for comprehensive planning for Quarter IV. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Regional Council called "The Time of our Lives," a retreat for those who care, combines review of freedom and church sections of RS-1 with seminary and sodality from first three weeks of ecclesiola and six of the Beatitudes conversations and gets largest turnout all year. Internal: House launches new quarter's covenanted ecclesiola with two new families participating.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the resources of the entire region in doing the Indianahoma HDP. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: 13 more events bring Mississippi 200 total to 127. Set-up begins on last two TM districts. State assembly brochure is printed and 5,000 name mailing list assembled for pre-assembly monthly newsletters. Internal: Dorothy, Fred and Greg are sent out for Easter visits with their families after which key colleagues arrive for House Church and Clements' 25th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Operating as one cohesive unit so that consensus procedures are not lost in the shuffle. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Ticket sellers are commissioned for the regional premiere of the global film at the "International Evening" on March 31.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat Visitation climaxed by 35 colleagues attending buffet and global catch-up.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the troops to do the work of the region. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: The circuit bustles with activity in five polises this week: GWF in Bloomington, global slides and local plan workshop in Claypool, CYF in Indianapolis, places secured for assembly. Internal: The House receives quarterly update of the Order life manual's assignments, rationales and time designs, signalling readiness for full speed ahead into the Merry Month of May.

Contradiction: Operating out of one single focus for the miracle month of May. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Regional newsletter is completed in two evenings while continuing TM set-up and Development 100 percent of the time.

Internal: Wayside inn dynamic and fantastic HDTS collegium catalyze new spirit and new life.

Contradiction: Practicalizing the quarter maneuvers to the implemental level when the actual events change shape radically. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: In the midst of Area Council, Area Chicago staff arrives to lead Glens Falls assembly and Buffalo TM set-up training event.

Internal: Travel to Area Council in time for Friday evening start calls for pulling out all the stops . . . and winning.

Contradiction: Building the comprehensive engagement screen which will care for all colleagues. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: House task force night enables transformation of Area and Regional Council plans into Pennsylvania state campaign thrust.

Contradiction: Discerning which of the multitude of saturation possibilities will position House for Pennsylvania state campaign set-up. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Area Council focuses the attention of all troops on the Merry Month of May and the decision to ensure the HDPs will be ready for anyone to visit by June.

Internal: Daily Office prayers indicate corporate decision to breathe new life into Order structures and liturgy.

Contradiction: Solidifying corporate design enough to allow the regional initiative to bloom. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Trekkers meet for week of vacation and youth core staff demonstrate leadership capabilities. Starks women meet and plan design for thrift store they've named Chintz Cottage. Auxiliary members address Skowhegan Rotary on ways of serving communities.

Internal: Auxiliary enjoys Easter discontinuity and on return studies a JWM paper on meditation to prepare for fast day.

Contradiction: Developing a creative relationship with entrenched opposition. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. Cambridge Town Meeting, Binghamton Town Meeting assembly and Albany Metro debriefing wind up quarter's Town Meeting campaign with two clusters of events held and one Assembly yet to go.

Internal: Looking ahead to next quarter through collegiums on "Ten Considerations in Community Reformulation" and quarter vision enables nonchalance with core and releases their creativity.

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: The executive director of a New Hampshire Human Services Coordinating Council says yes to a series of TMs in the fall.

Internal: Clean-up of the mini-park adjacent to the House catalyzes the participation by next door neighbor.

Contradiction: Working through a campaign night GSF dynamic without getting stuck in a particular structure. (Wk. 5)

## **MONTREAL**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: External focus shifts as saturation report on Montreal School committee workshops is sent in, GWF report is mailed out and attention shifts to Esplanade polis with gridding PSU.

Internal: Area Council is held in great style: \$1,500 of hotel inkind, \$500 of food inkind, meeting space provided by College Francais, global film night hosted by colleagues in hotel rooms with wine and cheese and *Deer Hunter* conversation takes place in local restaurant.

Contradiction: Engaging Those Who Care in the ethnic groupings of the Esplanade neighborhood and the established agencies to allow them to identify real, comprehensive challenges. (Wk. 5)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Guardian opens door to mayor's steering committee on social issues, and conversations begin to establish a working relationship. LENS is held with regional managers of Royal Trust Real Estate Division. Four colleagues attend area meeting.

Internal: Collegiality is experienced during Area Council when area views *The World of Human Development* and *The Deer Hunter* with great Greek food.

Contradiction: Creating objective image of local, regional frame. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Two more forum dates are set in Sudbury. Report on North Leeds saturation goes to press. Area Council finds itself planning for a year ahead and nationally.

Internal: New dryer is donated by Area Council.

Contradiction: Creating quarter-long vision to structure in possibilities for campaign funding and support. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Ross Anderson, architect from Indian and Northern Affairs, Restoration Division of Ottawa visits with Lorne, sees slide show and proposes plan for downtown core development. Quebec Shingle Sawyer and wife visit with recommendations for mill and training grant is submitted. Opening of finishing shop for Lorne Craft Woodworking provides new momentum in kitchen cabinet construction.

Internal: House travels to Montreal for Area Council and Project planning afterwards which enables new perspective and more comprehensive approach for Lorne and future expansion.

Contradiction: Structuring engagement of colleagues in the region and area to stabilize Lorne programs and to establish support systems for saturation expansion in the future. (Wk. 5)

## CARACAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Sector meetings decide on local clean up and meeting to make plans for May village festival. Cano Negro HDP participates in Caracas flea market with sheet booth.

Internal: Global GWF team arrives and intensifies recruitment of GWF and LENS.

Contradiction: Coordinating with troops in several places on different fronts. (Wk. 3)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Irrigation system is demonstrated in green house. Health worker core completes second round of study. Rabbit project acquires additional rabbits. Marketing teams made up of auxiliary staff, Santiago women Guardians and Sol de Septiembre women search out handiworks markets.

Internal: Self-conscious celebration using Christian poetry and mythology of Holy Week sheds light on gifts of experimentation with symbolic life.

Contradiction: Providing needed training in basic methods and critical sustaining contexts for emerging core leaders. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Community meeting focuses on what needs to be done in the HDP before June's first year anniversary, seeing improved roads and electricity as indicatives. A new bridge is built, allowing bus transportation to enter and leave the community. Agriculture receives donated seeds for the experimental station and the home garden program. MOBREAL, the government literacy program, agrees to sponsor and salary three local teachers for literacy, art, home gardening and nutritional cooking classes. ITI recruitment gains momentum with 10,000 cruzeiros scholarship money developed. A new Bananeiras song is created and sung at the community meeting. The preschool is moved to Program Center. Health Caretakers begin nutrition survey.

Internal: Mr. Dethleaves for Brazilia and Chile after having completed the community master plan and community center model.

Contradiction: Enabling community leadership structurally. (Wk. 5)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: National Commercial Bank agrees to "being on the hook" for IADB loan, and to help train local loan committee. Development banks \$1,100 Jamaican. Noel and Verlene attend synods of three denominations for ITI recruitment. Tool pool management training is completed.

Internal: Easter discontinuity allows repainting guest room and collegium floor, and all return with resurrected vision.

Contradiction: Launching a quarter that has already begun. (Wk. 5)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Earth tremor disrupts global slide show presentation to 150 residents of Azpitia, narrated by Lus Marina Aponte. Consult proposal is submitted to Maryknoll. Metro cadre grids Lima Area.

Internal: House writes quarter maneuvers, sets up internal life assignments, and hosts Castro family on brief visit en route to Rio ITI.

Contradiction: Unblocking speed of operation and public image of stability through locating office space, phone and transportation. (Wk. 4)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Andrew Young is confirmed to be guest speaker at July 25th event in Chicago. Extraordinary maneuvers are planned for five extraordinary Development troops to close April with \$140,000 victory in one week. One week of planning for Ivy City enables assured market victory of one million dollars. The push on public image is seen as a gift in articulating the network of friends built over the last 25 years. The key contradiction lies in the arena of articulating the turn of Development toward new methods of utilizing available resources and networks for clout and support.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports in-the-field research as the Hong Kong Nexus participates in 105 GCFs on Mactan Island, and a methods training module refinement is given its fourth run in Bontoa. The Panchayat Visitation to the Chicago Nexus occasions reflection on the future of impact and demonstration in North America and on emerging images of the Global Servant Force. Reports on the power of the global film as an impact and authorization tool comes in as copies return from Africa and from across North America. Images for the GRA in Chicago in July begin to emerge. A proposal is written for an assembly drawing together the learnings from two decades of experiments in human development by a broad range of agencies including the ICA. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding the large images and refining the tools needed to catapult the Movement into a new orbit for Quarter IV and the coming year.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Quarter IV is launched with Sixteenth Guardians Consult, largest yet, preceded by project director's meeting. Two of four LENS seminars with Minnesota Department of Transportation give opportunity to train new staff. Villagers lead impact treks in Indonesia while Australian CMA moves into two new states. Maharastra Month participants are deeply excited by Nava Gram Prayas and are reluctant to return home. ECF in Indonesia reveals high interest by businessmen and request for more. The key contradiction lies in the arena of carefully placing troops to enable momentum to build for Quarter IV win.

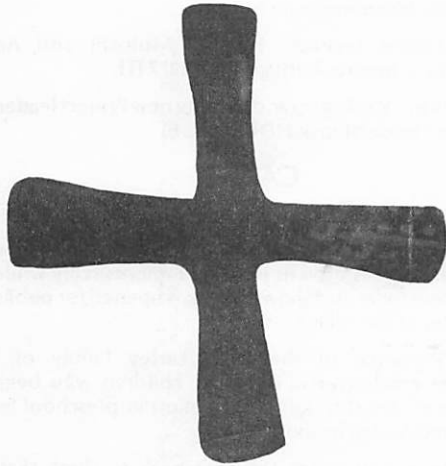
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports on a week of dispersion and focused thrusts. Fiscal Services in Chicago sends out two people to Majuro, one to Australia and one to Canada to work with EDGE and audits. Facilities are a focus with a continuing search for a Hong Kong Nexus facility and the launch of a quarter-long environmental campaign in the Chicago Nexus in preparation for the GRA. One 56-hour printing blitz produces copies of ten different Human Development module manuals for HUD and the Projects. The trend emerging is that the management dynamic is more and more on-the-road as management emerges as a focus in the global Movement. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the needed focus and remaining flexible in maneuvering with troops and funds tight on all fronts.

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: House travels to Manchester for Area Council. Reports are presented on three years of Isle of Dogs HDP and CYF as part of Town Meeting campaign. Polis coverage campaign is launched anew as area wide circuit begins.

Internal: Six House members go on area maneuver and 18 German students spend three days at House.

Contradiction: Setting up adequate system for polis coverage with TM. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Community worker phones in requesting a Town Meeting signalling another polis ready. House car and driver go to Manchester for area maneuvers while map and materials are prepared for upcoming Scotland blitz.

Internal: Paul Dyhr's company sends official appeal to secure a work permit.

Contradiction: Covering the polises quickly, yet leaving a base for future phases. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Beautiful Easter sunshine creates mood of new hopefulness and catalyzes the start of work on building foundations, community rugby game, packed hall for carnival queen dance, and painting of benches in the park.

Internal: Spring cleaning raises spirits and produces a large pile of rubbish, a new garden and an inventory of inkind paint.

Contradiction: Instilling courage in the reliable, down to earth leadership to make the corporate leap to the impossible "doing." (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: After Area Council, troops are gathered from six Houses and centrums for the first week of the "Town Meeting Jubilee" campaign including 200 letters, 300 phone calls, 70 Development letters, revised workbook and procedures, two TMs held and four set up. Four colleagues lend telephones, and two more volunteer time.

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: LeChene stronghold is set up for next October following a Community Forum in that county: 18 forums, 3 GWFs, 3 CYFs, LENS and assembly will cover every village in the county. Second stronghold is set up, following the Dijon Polis forum for November. The report of the polis coverage campaign is completed and ready for translation.

Internal: House is delighted with visit of Margreet Farid from El Bayad for Development.

Contradiction: Capturing the power of all the explosions of new possibility following the completion of the polis coverage campaign. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: First week of work in the industry building is completed. Letter arrives with promises of as many orders as can be produced.

Internal: House participates in village Easter celebrations including the Stations of the Cross procession.

Contradiction: Claiming the incredible victories of Quarter III while cleaning up the details in Quarter IV. (Wk. 6)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Marathon management meeting and 15-strong community planning days symbolize emerging community iron, while news of inkind drums and borehole from Lever Brothers and Taylor Woodrow are received with glee. Larentis technical truck arrives and eight sweaty hours later streetlights blaze into life again after Lenten pause. CIDA site visit impacts Director with Project seriousness.

Internal: A week of glorious victory is celebrated on the occasion of an auxiliary birthday with fabulous Chinese feast at Mr. K. P. Yu's house in the Niche mtex compound, and a romp in his swimming pool.

Contradiction: Setting arenas of responsibility concretely on the shoulders of leaders and employees. (Wk. 5)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus rides to a whirlwind finish with the Diamond Hexagon Campaign for Town Meeting in France.

Internal: Week II conversations on the mythology of the 20th Century zero in on the relevancy of the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Using the advantage of the corporate to enable the task effectively. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House celebrates week of wonder for the Benelux Waltz: eight TMs orchestrated, four set by phone in Amsterdam, and phone call from colleague for workshop leader training and stronghold setup.

Internal: Area remaneuvering and celebration get House all in one place for Week II.

Contradiction: Making the shift from polis brigade to stronghold circus masters. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Four Dorpsdags are set up in one day in foray to kick off Dutch Done Maneuver. Pledge comes in to bring House close to \$1,000 in-hand for month.

Internal: Continental Maneuver troops sweep in with miracles in their path and whisk House away to Brussels for remaneuver session.

Contradiction: Breaking loose new level of colleague participation in GCF campaign. (Wk. 6)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Three vehicles head north for the Hannover Hustle (Phase I on the Great German Gamble) after a four-day respite of maneuver building highlighted by readings from *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*. When women's group of a local church declines the opportunity, pastor takes team into psychiatric hospital for first *Gemeindeforum* within that heretofore un-dreamed-of network.

Internal: New decor embracing the Hannover Hustle, the Munich Monopoly, and the Stuttgart Shuffle brightens the office with pool tables, deed cards and four aces.

Contradiction: Creating the offers that cannot be refused which will allow volunteers to step forward to man the Volkswagens and control center. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Cafe Laterne is repainted and decorated by community on their own initiative. Full six-week English course begins with two exciting lessons of two hours each.

Internal: Maria Maguire returns from India with a long, insightful report and Barbara Allerdin returns from Rome talk to 100 Religious Superiors.

Contradiction: Empowering the community task forces as leadership nurture structures. (Wk. 6)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Betty Kaunda, wife of His Excellency the President, spends time at the Kapini HDP display at National Health Show, first stop following her talk, escorted by loyal Guardian. Zambian Airways gives 15 free tickets to Nairobi for HDTs participants. Guilds do Quarter IV planning, week's maneuvers and April budget taking eight hours out of daily work. African continent builds strategies in Nairobi.

Internal: House receives Eusebio Muloshi and Ackim Chimusanya as interns, both grads of 1977 ITI.

Contradiction: Raising up and training new Project leadership with present leadership at HDTs. (Wk. 6)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Water gushing forth from *hanafeyas* (public water taps) in all six stakes drowns images of impossibility while the first complete toilet and shower block is opened for public use in the center of the village.

Internal: Presence of the Greg Farley family of four necessitates creation of a dorm for children who begin to impact the village through participation in preschool lesson planning and Arabic lessons.

Contradiction: Discerning the next peak to climb that will beckon village motivation now that water is accessible to every home. (Wk. 5)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Final week of prep for HDTs begins as Zambian and Nigerian colleagues arrive to plug into huge task of construction and set-up. Recruitment continues in Kawangware, Kamweleni and particularly in the rest of Machakos District following up Village Meetings. Approximately US\$3,500 comes in from LENS seminars and enables tight cash flow. Two new facilities arise as if from the dust as first building is completed in just two days.

Internal: Family check enables Nairobi House and other staff, who arrived early to set-up school, to celebrate in grand style with meal and dancing at the Nairobi Hotel.

Contradiction: Creating support structures that keep the cash-in-hand coming in that will allow the HDTs to move with power. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTs which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Finance Commission meeting in Jakarta designates expenditure of USAID grants (US\$30,000 of a total US\$60,000). Plans are completed for Panchayat visitation. All materials are turned in for Singapore registration to Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Internal: Nexus is impacted by a collegium on experimental retreat.

Contradiction: Engaging futurically in a month of helpless waiting for decision on registration in Singapore. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: University of Technology Malaysia students are brought to Serusup HDP by district officer as only exhibition of district's three demonstration villages. Serusup Handicrafts wins first, second and third prize at district fair. Datuk Harris, Chief Minister, compliments Project and project global market for economic programs. Village company is formed with Board of Directors of one representative from each guild and each space chosen at community meeting. Two international economics consultants learn about Project.

Internal: House undergoes massive renovation after receiving first full program check of Project.

Contradiction: Recreating neglected community space. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: The village is in a state of high excitement after 28 go through several nights of planning, setting up 16 priorities for themselves, deciding on six task forces with chosen leaders for each with the assignment to gather five more for each, decision to meet every Saturday night so Kuala Lumpur working people can be present and all conducted in "A Number One" translation style by three extended auxiliary. Excitement builds even higher with the news that 30 from the Ministry of Social Welfare will be coming to Sungai Lui on Thursday to see what they call a demonstration village. Steady work all week reconciles the books between Singapore, Serusup, and Sungai Lui. First income and reorder is received for crochet glass covers. A 24-hour village wedding celebration has rock music echoing through the whole village.

Internal: One day of energized work transforms the kitchen from a sow's ear to a silk purse by painting, adding a ceiling, buying a "new" two year old refrigerator after four months of being without one, and getting an inkind stainless steel double sink.

Contradiction: Steering through all the special interest groups to the concept that all are interested in doing the whole village with the whole group. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: New Camat district officer makes Kelapa Dua his first official visit, indicating a new decision by the local government to adopt the Project. Development push gets underway with \$1,950 in hand received this week.

Internal: Lynda Cock's brother visits and gives dental demonstration for preschool children.

Contradiction: Deciding steps in response to door opened by Camat's visit. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Two go to Siantar for credit union training while three more Community Meetings brings total to 11 since impact trek. UNICEF and local company come through with dry milk for initiation of nutrition program in preschool. While village fishing cooperative is initiated. House worries about duck loan as 40 ducks die of stomach ailment. Governor takes personal hand in getting staff three month visas until one-year visas come through.

Internal: Papaya trees planted from seeds in front of House reach four feet high, proving possibility for wider plantings; the first plant the goats won't eat.

Contradiction: Increasing number of staff and villagers who take on implementation. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Woman in Ujung Pandang inkind four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Five villagers attend ecclesiola and participate fully.

Contradiction: Creating structures to use newly gained workshop skills in planning practical action. (Wk. 5)

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Development raises US\$18,000 in Manila. Staff are sent to Korea, Taiwan, the Philippines and Hong Kong.

Internal: Four-day Easter holiday enables health claim update and completion of ICA monthly report, in the midst of participating in the canonical hours.

Contradiction: Building the models that enable doing the on-going tasks while finding a new facility. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Cupboard and air conditioner are donated to dental clinic. Parents attend Easter holiday session of primary guidance group and youth group begin the next newsletter with almost no prompting. The last major landholders come back from Europe's Chinese restaurants to sell their land to the Nam Wai Foundation, and the chairman prepares travel documents for Chicago visit. Another social service agency confirms forum date for their staff.

Internal: Clare Bonnell returns with encouraging reports of Philippine clusters after visiting all three regions with Hong Kong Guardian and Panchayat team.

Contradiction: Shifting the village's self image to Phase III while continuing thrusts in Development and turning Hong Kong gold. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Guardian meeting in Taipei discusses Hai Ou's future economic development. Crabs and prawn fry are sold with US\$3,000 profit.

Internal: House celebrates with dinner and a movie in Kaohsiung as quarter planning recreates House structure.

Contradiction: Building models that allow new construction and business expansion to be funded. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Langub HDP economic programs are intensified with visits to engineer of Republic of Philippines AID Barangay Water Program, joint venture negotiations for brick industry, purchase of 50 kilos special mango seeds and securing of electrical system generator, lights and wiring. Head of Republic of Philippines AID mission visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Diane Quinteller, lecturer at graduate school of De La Salle University, is guest at House Church.

Contradiction: Forming of next year's picture that enhances the global Movement. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: With NT\$182,000 in-hand for past two weeks and NT\$320,000 projected before the end of April, the first NT\$500,000 (US\$13,888) month is now in sight for Taiwan Development.

Internal: Discount airline fares for summer travel are obtained, and invitation letters to GRA from Chicago Nexus arrive for Peter Hu and Katherine Cheng.

Contradiction: Documenting the second year victory of Hai Ou's economic and social programs to release new orbits of support and engagement from emerging colleagues. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Second Sudtonggan Human Development Training School begins with 34 participants and staff of 22, doubling the size of first school. Staff arrives from Kenya, Indonesia, Malaysia and the United States with new building finished. Suba Panas, San Miguel, Malingin, and Baska Mercado guilds plan huge economic fair to cap April economic intensification. House welcomes back Project director, Ching On, from Hong Kong and sends out Carl Hickey as staff move.

Internal: Panchayat is big hit of the week as they show global film to 500 villagers and HDTs students.

Contradiction: Sorting out the chaos which confuses the great leap. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: House sends out 58 participants to the HDTs from the five villages in the mountain cluster. The tractor arrives and starts plowing 30 hectares, 2,500 feet of pipe is laid and the water system is turned on bringing regular water to the mountain top for the first time. Davao City sends 20 truckloads of gravel for the Langub road.

Internal: Global Panchayat visits and tours four new Projects in the first vehicle to make it completely across the mountain ridge trail.

Contradiction: Getting everything ready for the four Consults. (Wk. 6)

### **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Thirty attend an incredible national Guardians meeting. Eight come as official representatives of companies. Three new TM sponsors sign up: Cathay Pacific Airline (1,000,000 yen in tickets), AFIA Insurance and Seven-Up. National Jaycee executive director will help promote TM in 640 chapters.

Internal: Student sojourners begin to lead House meals after a training collegium.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of how to leap from 100 Town Meetings to 1000 Town Meetings. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Pastors class increases to ten students. In the village lane paving is underway and preschool registration procedures move ahead. Project report brochure nears completion as third draw of USAID grant arrives.

Internal: Holy Week celebration with Easter fast and vigil activated by great Dunne study.

Contradiction: Performing immediate action while holding the tension between national demands and Project imperatives. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Extensive inkind network is engaged from paint to Crown Beer in preparation for one year celebration at Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Law office permeator's income is boosted by more than half to monthly net of US\$1,650, exceeding total House budget by 25%.

Contradiction: Having only one free finger while three buttons need pushing. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Visit to county chief reveals abundant Project praise, \$6,000 commitment for village truck, assurances of phones and 20 new homes, and his intent to forward special report commending the Project to President Park this fall.

Internal: School enrollment of Park children contains outward-bound dimension as it involves three mile daily hike over the mountain.

Contradiction: Allowing Project celebration plans and needs to enhance rather than foreclose fullness of the multitude of spring tasks in a rural village. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Beginning of Kyushu Maneuver circuit trips yields two TMs in works and one possible in Miyazaki, and in Saga complete framing and one more TM is set up with Jaycees. **SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: CMA possibilities continue to be explored as letters go out to provincial Sisters of Mercy in New South Wales and House is invited to do a two page article for the Local Government Association Bulletin. Day 1 colleague meeting turns into half day event as several folks drop in for a bite of lunch and missional chat.

Internal: Easter weekend is celebrated with work (retiling kitchen floor, reclaiming vegie garden), canonical hours, church attendance, seeing the film *Black Orpheus* and feasting.

Contradiction: Moving with power in a shifting universe. (Wk. 5)

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Colleagues attending Panchayat visit event are excited by meeting Toronto Guardians Ann and David Patterson, and seeing global film and slides of Murrin Bridge shown by local Guardian Dr. John Murchland. Seven more Community Meetings are done in midst of which House discovers host committee chairman from CM held in Pt. Pirie three years ago holding great forums in his district.

Internal: *Way of All the Earth* study is a highlight of Panchayat visit, affirming what House is about.

Contradiction: Configuring troops to sustain them in the area mission with three more state campaigns still to go. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Week is marked by significant doors opening: Sir Roger Darvall (ICA National Advisory Board) and 35 others enjoy global film at guest night, and framing and preliminary plan is built for saturation maneuver in Springvale.

Internal: Easter House Church breakfast with Panchayat is highlighted by local snapper fish and Easter egg hunt.

Contradiction: Aiming available clout on strategic campaign targets. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

External: First picnic table comes off production line. Celebration of the first year is highlighted by three hour softball game and a gala disco on the tennis court. Proposal for wages in industries is written.

Internal: House sends out Voslers to USA and Olive to Nairobi.

Contradiction: Keeping all acts going while half the magicians disappear. (Wk. 3)

**SUVA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: The experiment of having stake and guild meetings on the same evening increases participation of people in the showplace.

Internal: Showplace women surprise entire House with 5:00 a.m. birthday serenade (Marshallese tradition) for Rachel Jones.

Contradiction: Locating the key that releases training events through established structures. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: Project decision making jumps into future with creation and first meeting of village secretariat. While preschool learns how to use fishing net, library is reorganized, and discarded oil drums are obtained for water catchment demonstration.

Internal: The journey of Lent is celebrated with Easter morning House Church and Easter Monday is delightful shift as auxiliary cleans, plants garden and has a picnic lunch.

Contradiction: Risking with HDP after discovering it's not another foreign aid project, but hard work. (Wk. 6)

**SAN FRANCISCO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Divide and conquer is the theme as one-third of remaining adults in House spend Week II in Sacramento catalyzing colleague participation in raising \$1500 in self-support, holding a GWF and participating in Richgrove maneuvers. Richgrove participating in a workday which clears the railroad right-of-way for a mile, roofs the flea market, updates and creates business systems for the Richgrove Kitchen, and builds the four county saturation maneuver which will do 20 TMs in four weeks.

Internal: House celebrates two birthdays.

Contradiction: Caring for the internal structures to release resources for the external mission. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP**

External: Village Chief reports that Minto is the first village to submit a proposal to the Department of Fish and Game. A compromise proposal is hammered out between Minto and the Fairbanks Sportsmans Association for control of movement of hunters and fisherman in the Minto area. External: Preparation for Indiahoma year-end celebration continues with Roger in Indiahoma for a week and the entire Hosue present for a workday there.

Internal: Colleague leads seminary as House continues with great ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Setting priorities to release maximum results from limited time and troops. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: Dallas House and Guardian do inkinding and workday in Indiahoma preparing for May 5th anniversary celebration.

Internal: House launches new quarter's covenanted ecclesiola with two new families participating.

Contradiction: Mobilizing the resources of the entire region in doing the Indianoma HDP. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: Twelve TMs, one CYF and 34 planning meetings are set in final two state districts. PFT group (social commission) elects officers in step towards incorporation. Internal: Michele Meyers and her two children, neighborhood residents, begin month sojourn.

Contradiction: Determining the next strategic move relative to positioning for next year. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: Framing visit to Carolina Power and Light Regional Manager uncovers the fact that the President of CP&L is on Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation Board of Directors and particularly interested in the Gibson Project. Regional Manager spends half day in Gibson, unknown to Project staff, just talking to the people about the Project. All reports are positive. CP&L wants to help with downtown beautification by removing power wires and poles and installing new street lights.

Internal: Powell's extended family visit for the weekend is culminated by Saturday night celebration with black and white represented and a workshop on innovative housing.

Contradiction: Producing visible signs as well as building foundations and breaking open possibilities for Gibson Day. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Staff expansion enables House to cover both ends of the region including TM demonstration in Orlando Metro with transplanted Northerners and CYF in Southern Georgia.

Internal: House discovers the expandability of the new House with Development team and the surprise arrival of Jose' Griego enroute to Kingston.

Contradiction: Building a tight corporate model which will expand the resources and troops to do the job required. (Wk. 6)

## CHICAGO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: In one week blitz, Development raises \$109,000 toward closing April. Merry Month of May victory charts by area are posted in Campaign Lounge. Kinney HDP inkinds enough xerographic paper for the GRA.

Internal: Nexus sends out Danny O'Neill to Widen HDP for mural creation and welcomes Joe and Araceli Mathews.

Contradiction: Creating symbology that makes May a magic month rather one to be "tuffed" out. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: One of the finest Area Councils is held at Chicago House with overall flow and preparation *par excellence*, and focus on May with tactics for concrete expenditure.

Internal: Fixing House roof becomes symbol of mundanity that is life, and along with other repairs, continues to keep House looking great.

Contradiction: Putting emphasis on catalyzing leadership toward the future. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Metro cadre meeting in Omaha assumes responsibility for stronghold there. Cards of interest continue to come back from stronghold mailing; bankers and Methodist laymen are tied.

Internal: New computer uses, from preparing the response letters to the stronghold mailing, has the entire metro fascinated.

Contradiction: Discerning where available time can be maximized. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Six events, including Town Meetings, social methods presentations, LENS seminar and others are held. A LENS seminar is submitted to Minnesota Department of Administration which leaves only one or two state departments which have not yet had a forum or seminar conducted by the ICA.

Internal: The first LENS pedagogy to be held outside of Nexus since the new wave of LENS seminars began is held with 15 attentive participants.

Contradiction: Keeping manpower covenants increasing at the same rate that the programs are booked in order to do a thorough job of impact and follow-up on all fronts. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Eight showings of global film break open myriad of arenas including: leads for urban and rural impact, Guardian engagement, old friends and colleagues, and Development prospects.

Internal: Visitors from Development, Mill Shoals and Montreal enliven life of House, especially Daily Office and collegiums.

Contradiction: Orchestrating six maneuvers to be dance of final quarter, not frantic race. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: Memorial Day celebration is authorized with sponsorship from School Board, Town Board, Puritan Club and churches.

Internal: House receives call from VISTA Director with supportive suggestions on public image.

Contradiction: Tying down specific commitments with groups and individuals that become a sign that the Memorial Day celebration is happening. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: Women's industry spends six hours battleplanning for the next three months. Trek to upper Wisconsin and Michigan TM towns uncovers both cynicism and care. Jaycees meeting in Kinney ponders a suggestion to recruit by blocks until someone reminds the group, "We don't have blocks, we have stakes!"

Internal: Albert Bellamy receives serious burns, and House experiences small town care as everyone in Kinney expresses concern.

Contradiction: Opening eyes of community at large to see its creativity is needed and ready to be used. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Shirley St. John spends three days in Fifth City working on a public relations strategy for the State of Illinois for the Merry Month of May. The House begins calling campaign to entice colleagues and friends to spend weekends in Lorimor.

Internal: Inking hits a new high after old sources attend the global film and receive invitation to join in Lorimor during the month of May.

Contradiction: Fascinating TWC with all the possibilities of this moment while planning the fall maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Phoning for global film and international buffet provides opportunity to renew contact with large number of Movement friends. Global film evening evokes serious and hopeful response. Newest contact is the last to leave and cadre colleagues outdo themselves with delicious food and gracious hosting.

Internal: Beatitude conversations are the spirit highpoint of metro ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Handling logistics and scheduling to enable metro colleague participation in the Merry Month of May and June consults. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Over 1,000 participate in awakening programs including one high school TM with 900 students and faculty.

Internal: House gets ready for rummage sale anticipating relocation sometime in June.

Contradiction: Engaging trained and committed colleagues rather than putting avalanche of immediate events on House. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: House kicks off the quarter with a CYF in Madison Heights involving 150 students from three high schools and a key Town Meeting in the Bay City stronghold attended by economic, political and cultural authorization.

Internal: House holds first rotating Saturday morning ecclesiola at Guardian's home to enable region to prepare for Global Research Assembly.

Contradiction: Operating out of convenience rather than missional need. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: The leadership of Paulding County gathers to decide to hold a county assembly. Some of the communities even decide to do demonstration TMs early. This pushes the House to do a rural mailing to all counties and offer them this unique chance to have all their TMs and the assembly at the same time in the same place.

Internal: The Bergren family, TM grads, stop in for House Church because they say something must motivate and sustain House and they want to find out just what it is.

Contradiction: Centering in on the most powerful possibilities, while being washed over by ten times more demands that cannot possibly be responded to. (Wk. 6)

## **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: House members lead a forum for tenants of 56 Seventh Avenue, New York, which results in the formation of a tenants' association and the practical plan to organize corporate enablement of building services during building service employees' strike.

Internal: The collegium rehearsing the journey of the Summers stimulates discussion of the role of Summer '79 and anticipation of dealing with the Institute's new public prominence.

Contradiction: Doing adequate debriefing and evaluation that articulates new position and then acting on it. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Regional newsletter is completed in two evenings while continuing TM set-up and Development 100 percent of the time.

Internal: Wayside inn dynamic and fantastic HDTs collegium catalyze new spirit and new life.

Contradiction: Practicalizing the quarter maneuvers to the implemental level when the actual events change shape radically. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Nunda and Manchester TMs activate two more strongholds. Nunda proposes early June ECF as follow-up to TM with Chamber of Commerce Committee appointed to assure its success. Niagara Frontier Stronghold is blitzed by Buffalo colleagues; two dates are set.

Internal: Alice Rose qualifies for city track meet and Elaine Butcher gets accepted to college.

Contradiction: Developing the agility to focus limited corporate time on key corporate happenings. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Mayor Marion Barry personally calls to say House is in Community Development Area 5, which means Ivy City is now eligible for all community programs and funds available to the district—advocates are at work! Twenty-six supporters from the business community come for lunch.

Internal: With 28 guests in and out of the House, collegiums are key spirit events in sharing wisdom, vision and planning for summer.

Contradiction: Building generals in the battle of May. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Youth show that they can take responsibility for their community through lot clean-up, Town Meeting visits, planning Easter dance and celebrating by seeing *Superman*.

Internal: Area visitors enable arenas to get covered that ordinarily do not and provide for a really fine ecclesiola night.

Contradiction: Keeping an imaginal picture of the road ahead before House. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: RS-I is completely recruited and set up by local person who had a course in Cincinnati ten years ago. Sixteen around the table reflect again the power of the Word.

Internal: Task force gets off the ground relative to state wide saturation and demonstration.

Contradiction: Moving as a whole state towards positioning for the state campaign. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Thirty-five attend wine and cheese showing of the global film at Dick and Ethel Smyres' house in New Jersey. A man invited that day says that he is looking for a way to spend two years in the Third World.

Internal: A fierce soccer game signals the end of the set-up of ten positional awakening events and the beginning of the Miracle Month of May.

Contradiction: Articulating the new position and acting effectively on it. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: The month of May begins miraculously with equipment located to ready woodshop for an inspection visit and a big contract. A truckload of clothes arrives from Sudbury church for the thrift store, and three events are set by the roving impact team—all this in three days.

Contradiction: Catalyzing community engagement in building the practical plans for more miracles in May. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Development intensification week, "Thawing the Frozen Assets", yields \$2,792 in-hand and \$9,074 solidly committed. The week is kicked off with a fine dinner at the Holiday Inn, highlighted by a showing of the film, *The World of Human Development*. The film is used as a contextual impact tool, rather than a direct fund-raiser.

Internal: House personnel quadruples for the week—eight instead of two, through great collegial joining of centrum, area, House and metro forces.

Contradiction: Designing and maintaining the follow-up on the leads opened up during the week. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. Cambridge Town Meeting, Binghamton Town Meeting assembly and Albany Metro debriefing wind up quarter's Town Meeting campaign with two clusters of events held and one Assembly yet to go.

Internal: Looking ahead to next quarter through collegiums on "Ten Considerations in Community Reformulation" and quarter vision enables nonchalance with core and releases their creativity.

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: The executive director of a New Hampshire Human Services Coordinating Council says yes to a series of TMs in the fall.

Internal: Clean-up of the mini-park adjacent to the House catalyzes the participation by next door neighbor.

Contradiction: Working through a campaign night GSF dynamic without getting stuck in a particular structure. (Wk. 5)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: House embraces tension of sophisticated lifestyle through Area Council, facility in kind polish and permeation, while continuing to ground itself in urban ethnic ghetto of Esplanade Polis in preparation for stronghold actuation.

Internal: Two clergy from Ottawa attending National Assembly of Division of Missions, United Church of Canada, are billeted immediately after departure of Halifax House.

Contradiction: Enabling local man to give of himself, not just his material/money contributions. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: First GWF is held in Halton Stronghold as new local advocates reveal several immediate CYF possibilities. Toronto moves one more step along the road of strategic private sector framing as Better Business Bureau membership is approved. New urban networks open up with religious orders and two national church structures.

Internal: A dozen colleagues participate in House structures throughout week highlighted by David and Ann Patterson's report on their Panchayat trip in Australia.

Contradiction: Building the bridge over the gap between knowing what needs to be done and coming up with results. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Two more forum dates are set in Sudbury. Report on North Leeds saturation goes to press. Area Council finds itself planning for a year ahead and nationally.

Internal: New dryer is donated by Area Council.

Contradiction: Creating quarter-long vision to structure in possibilities for campaign funding and support. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Ross Anderson, architect from Indian and Northern Affairs, Restoration Division of Ottawa visits with Lorne, sees slide show and proposes plan for downtown core development. Quebec Shingle Sawyer and wife visit with recommendations for mill and training grant is submitted. Opening of finishing shop for Lorne Craft Woodworking provides new momentum in kitchen cabinet construction.

Internal: House travels to Montreal for Area Council and Project planning afterwards which enables new perspective and more comprehensive approach for Lorne and future expansion.

Contradiction: Structuring engagement of colleagues in the region and area to stabilize Lorne programs and to establish support systems for saturation expansion in the future. (Wk. 5)

## CARACAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Lively community assembly determines quarter priorities and affirms sector support for chapel construction.

Internal: Holy Week retreat combines contextual reflection and quarterly maneuvers culminating in 12:15 am Easter morn feast.

Contradiction: Coordinating community volunteers with chapel work schedule to meet May 1 feast day deadline. (Wk. 6)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: First economically viable model for operating the rabbit project is presented in a collegium by the local manager, and represents a change in policy by the institution backing the rabbit industry. A sub-contract for making curtains is a breakthrough event and is a direct result of contacts made in the GWF. Prospective preschoolers and their mothers participate in a presentation of the program given by the local preschool teachers and view slides on Easter Island courtesy of a Santiago Guardian. Family photos are taken in Sector 1 helping solidify family and sector identity.

Internal: The installation of a Franklin-type stove constructed from an oil drum by a local welder changes frosty mornings into toasty ones and demonstrates a more efficient method of heating local homes.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary deeds without waiting for legalization and surviving the consequences. (Wk. 6)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Banana upgrading is begun as man from Emater comes and begins a series of meetings with banana *fazenda* owners and workers on solving the three contradictions: improving the quality of the banana, lowering transportation costs and finding more lucrative markets. High attendance shows this to be a hot issue in the community. Health caretakers' training is launched with representatives from each stake present. ITI recruitment is combined with Development with several participants committed and 35,000 cruzeiros (US\$1,750) in hand. Community decides quarter's educational possibilities at the community meeting. Fifth grade in Bananeiras looms as possibility as district educational representative goes on call with ICA staff to the new Secretary of Education.

Internal: Quarter IV battleplanning reveals this is the quarter of guilding Bananiras. Collegiums put flesh on planning by assigning every adult in the community to a guild. Wall of Wonder is begun in ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Launching the quarter with the necessary power in the Project and at the same time supporting the final weeks of the ITI. (Wk. 6)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: National Commercial Bank agrees to "being on the hook" for IADB loan, and to help train local loan committee,

Development banks \$1,100 Jamaican. Noel and Verlene attend synods of three denominations for ITI recruitment. Tool pool management training is completed.

Internal: Easter discontinuity allows repainting guest room and collegium floor, and all return with resurrected vision.

Contradiction: Launching a quarter that has already begun. (Wk. 5)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, inkind push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Internal: Access to nearby telephone simplifies Development calling and Saturday barhopping celebration with cadre colleague provides encounter with Peruvian folk music.

Contradiction: Dealing with inadequate practical arrangements in the face of ever-mounting missional demands. (Wk. 6)

The ICA annual report moves toward completion, an extraordinary Phase I campsite for summer releases curriculum planning, and significant work on retreat and modules in the field enlightens the edge. Implosions are set off by article, "Revolution in the Village," as collegium data begins to roll in from the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the underlying common standpoint of the mission in order to focus the summer effectively.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Singapore catches up on bills and progresses on first Malaysian audit and Australian audit. Brussels works on grant reports. Chicago sends out staff to Majuro, Sydney and Montreal to assist in financial management plus staff to support North American Merry Month of May. International Training Center is dressed up with plants and flowers at entrance and around parking lot. Band intensifies as task forces convene around tasks related to audits and grants. The key contradiction lies in the arena of gearing up to meet accelerating demands in the field relative to financial management.

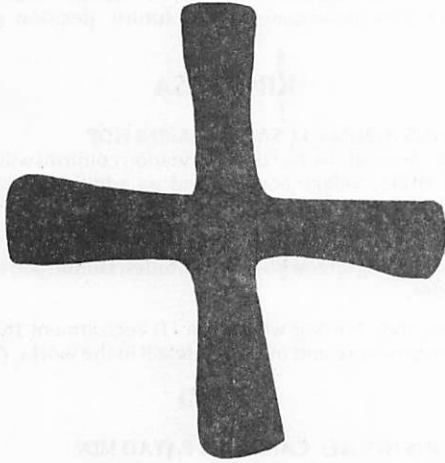

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

Visit with American Ambassador is very favorable; he agrees to provide introduction to strategic multinational corporation executives and Nuffield Foundation. Two more CYF dates are set by the Terrific Trio cluster.

Internal: House experiences national election and Margaret Thatcher win as Prime Minister as historical firsts.

Contradiction: Shifting awakening campaign strategies require Development repositioning. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: The community of Stonehaven colors another polis as TM set-up continues rapidly with 50 letters out to community councils network for another "jack pot."

Internal: Ruth Dyhr and Doug Allan take the "golden jet" to Manchester for the U.K. count down.

Contradiction: Weaving the story that allows local guides to see the gift of their situation and how they can be part of the miracle that is happening around them. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Beautiful Easter sunshine creates mood of new hopefulness and catalyzes the start of work on building foundations, community rugby game, packed hall for carnival queen dance, and painting of benches in the park.

Internal: Spring cleaning raises spirits and produces a large pile of rubbish, a new garden and an inventory of inked paint.

Contradiction: Instilling courage in the reliable, down to earth leadership to make the corporate leap to the impossible "doing." (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Cooperative guild meeting decides on work schedule in the factory and three women and one bookkeeper start. All seats are glued and legs slotted for 100 chairs and 25 tables. Fr. Raphael Davila and Father Bob Rank visit the Superior of the Jesuits and get authorization letter and warm reception. Spain foray report is completed and ready to mail.

Internal: Auxiliary attends sendout party for co-op member going to military service.

Contradiction: Finishing one maneuver well while those necessary for quarter completion wait on the back burner. (Wk. 7)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Marathon management meeting and 15-strong community planning days symbolize emerging community iron, while news of inkind drums and borehole from Lever Brothers and Taylor Woodrow are received with glee. Larentis technical truck arrives and eight sweaty hours later streetlights blaze into life again after Lenten pause. CIDA site visit impacts Director with Project seriousness.

Internal: A week of glorious victory is celebrated on the occasion of an auxiliary birthday with fabulous Chinese feast at Mr. K. P. Yu's house in the Nichemtex compound, and a romp in his swimming pool.

Contradiction: Setting arenas of responsibility concretely on the shoulders of leaders and employees. (Wk. 5)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: An accounting task force is formed involving Global Development and Global Management Centurms of Brussels and Bombay with the intent of looking at funds and grants of the European Economic Community and the Belgium government.

Internal: Nexus rehearses the context and selects the Panchayat in corporate session and grasps consensus after the new global strategies.

Contradiction: Clarifying quarter circuit and trek rationale within and among centurms. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Key authorization visit made with new circuit shadow gives nod and funding openings. Workshop leader training and maneuver session are awakenment events for whole cluster of villages.

Internal: India accounting task force finishes work in flurry of activity and two collegiums before leaving.

Contradiction: Journeying a group of people to decide to do saturation on time design. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: One and a half days of phoning set up remaining 13 Netherlands polises, eight of which are done in four days the same week.

Internal: House size doubles with addition of maneuver troops from Brussels and Paris, enabling the reflection on the historical context of the KLM (Kare for Local Man) Maneuver.

Contradiction: Turning new openings into hard advantages for next steps. (Wk. 7)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: With all German-speaking staff on the road, Geri and Blase train colleagues who volunteer to do two *Gemeindeforums* in the Frankfurt Region—one with 110 women. Geli Scheitler leads her first four *Gemeindeforums* within a 36-hour time span during the week that the Hannover Hustle maneuver nets 13.

Internal: Development team of Brian Williams and Berthold Schwaiger move just in time to take over with care and feeding the Emerging Generation while making major first moves on corporations.

Contradiction: Increasing methods of caring for new colleagues to keep pace with the increased rate of awakenment events. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Kinder's program begins again with solid promise from government to fund whole program. Community has great celebrative monthly meeting. The "Covenant Players" arrive to do a drama workshop with the community in the cafe.

Internal: Hans-Peter Brunner returns from four weeks in Academy roaring to go.

Contradiction: Establishing key structure that allows community to participate in key futuric decision making. (Wk. 7)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Second visit by Ford Foundation confirms willingness to fund HDTs, Village Forums, and six additional villages in district in 1979-80.

Internal: Ecclesiola is again the highlight of the week, starting earlier and going later with the Beatitudes, Dunne and the Wall of Wonder.

Contradiction: Putting wheels on ITI recruitment this week with new brochure and mailing lists still in the works. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Madame Aziza Hussein, President of the Cairo Women's Club, says yes to membership on the Egyptian ICA Board of Trustees. Clamp of 1200 beautiful Bayad bricks are fixed, signalling successful, renewed take-off of Bayad's desert clay brick industry.

Internal: First self-support money ever in Area Cairo comes in as a result of English tutoring in Cairo.

Contradiction: Using the vacuum created by the imminent departure to the Nairobi HDTs of bi-lingual Egyptian ICA staff to draw forth new leadership. (Wk. 7)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Focus on Kabiro (Stake 5) becomes reality as many troops from HDTs knock on doors, weigh babies, register KYC children, recruit HCT and engage residents in conversations of hopes and dreams relative to housing and visible signs. Technical visit to intermediate technology center is highlight of the week for villagers participating in the HDTs who see many possibilities for their communities. Five hundred Talapia arrive in Kawangware and stock first fish pond on DUF. Inkind hits 46,000 K.Shs for month of April (US\$6,200). HDTs participants celebrate following workdays in Kawangware and Kamweleni with African celebration that includes singing and dancing from the continent.

Internal: Doughty Ltd. contributes bright red Honda to keep area prior on the move.

Contradiction: Accepting the most challenging and demanding assignments ever for staff and participants alike following the HDTs. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Two-thirds of the community kitchen is built in six days as heavy rain pours continuously. District water engineer spends three hours working on possibilities of water from Ikiwe River, Kango dam and Kimutwa water supply. District development officer, Mr. Wambugu, promises material support on community kitchen after surprise accomplishment on construction. District adult education officer, Mr. Wathika, drops in the village by surprise with government guests from

Malawi for site visit and spends two hours telling Kamweleni story to the guests, who donate books for adult literacy. Health caretakers plant tomatoes and cabbages in health caretakers' demonstration *shamba*. At the same time, they list all children for Bilharzia testing sponsored by Machakos Lions Club. Ten more children join preschool after house to house visitation by stake leaders. Farmers finish ten cages for more new rabbits.

Internal: Heavy rains flood all rivers in the district for a week, cutting House from outside world.

Contradiction: Catalyzing total community participation in the midst of day and night heavy rains. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations

and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshepur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTS which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Lunch with Robert and Elanor Welty, parents of Christina Clark, provides again the great gift of the Guardian dynamic. Mr. and Mrs. Welty plan to visit Sungai Lui where he was part of the Consult team two years ago.

Internal: Nexus welcomes Mauno Wilkkinen on world bicycle trek who left his home of Finland January, 1972 and plans to be gone until January, 1982.

Contradiction: Engaging futurically in a month of helpless waiting for decision on registration in Singapore. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Panchayat arrives and is immediately pulled into ongoing community structures like leadership planning night and stakes and guilds. Community assembly draws over 100 adults and every house in village is represented. Births, deaths and weddings are celebrated and reports by guilds and victories for coming quarter are claimed. Global slide show with Serusup slides at end is significant ending to a great community assembly. Global film is shown in new community handicrafts building and leaves community wanting more. Guardians who view global film at tea are on edge of their chairs.

Internal: House has new Builders' Guild deal with House repairs and kitchen improvements.

Contradiction: Channelling the breakloose in the economic guilds when none of auxiliary have business 'know how'. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Thirty visitors representing a multiplicity of agencies and United Nations, all catalyzed by the Ministry of Social Welfare, has villagers walking two inches off the ground when they come by to tell about it. Saturday night's village planning meeting takes action the next day by confirming a certified typing teacher for training classes and getting a requisition list together for making the agriculture complex ready for opening. Seizing the opportunity of the Panchayat's presence, the global film is shown to the ICA Board of Directors and a number of Guardians who comment that "it should be shown to villagers to give them courage." Appointment with Dr. Nor Ghani appears to open up a West Malaysia strategy for doing Town Meetings.

Internal: John Cock comes along with the Panchayat who spark new images.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on the misdirected energies of the youth and plugging them into the plan of the village. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Project receives \$2,000 from Chase Manhattan Bank. Meeting is held to decide new names for the new Secretariat. Indonesian Guardians meeting is held with Panchayat to talk about forming an Indonesian Yayasan and the future work of ICA in Indonesia.

Internal: House sends out Lisa to university and Pomo to Sungai Lui.

Contradiction: Working out the right maneuvers and needs that are needed to complete the Project. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: Old stage is removed to clear village entrance way for Panchayat visit. Bubun grid is moved to complement symbolism of House. Eight Department of Education officials open sewing class. Contact is made to arrange opening of mechanic training course. Guardians' meeting at the home of lumber tycoon brings 60 to hear Duffy and Epps talk about the global task.

Internal: Laiya and Sutiya have new baby girl not yet named.

Contradiction: Catalyzing rapid village involvement in creating visible signs without financial dependence. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Woman in Ujung Pandang in kinds four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Five villagers attend ecclesiola and participate fully.

Contradiction: Creating structures to use newly gained workshop skills in planning practical action. (Wk. 5)

## HONG KONG

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Nexus facility search each day in Hong Kong goes on while six members are in Philippines: two for HDTs and one for Mountain Cluster Consults prep.

Internal: Time spent together in global collegiums helps keep past and present in perspective.

Contradiction: Maintaining long-term vision as moving day approaches. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: One hundred elderly participate in forum, and church holds CYF with youth group on same weekend. Nam Wai Foundation Board hosts fine dinner to send out Guardian to a month's home leave. 72 people from all stakes go on village outing. Dental clinic volunteers and advisors meet with villagers to make decision on accounting procedures and employ two village women as dental nurses.

Internal: Bob and Shirley Porter, Tony Clarke and Ken and Judy Hamje visit Project.

Contradiction: Cutting across established adults take it or leave it attitude to social programs. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Guardian meeting in Taipei discusses Hai Ou's future economic development. Crabs and prawn fry are sold with US\$3,000 profit.

Internal: House celebrates with dinner and a movie in Kaohsiung as quarter planning recreates House structure.

Contradiction: Building models that allow new construction and business expansion to be funded. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Langub HDPEconomic programs are intensified with visits to engineer of Republic of Philippines AID Barangay Water Program, joint venture negotiations for brick industry, purchase of 50 kilos special mango seeds and securing of electrical system generator, lights and wiring. Head of Republic of Philippines AID mission visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Diane Quinteller, lecturer at graduate school of De La Salle University, is guest at House Church.

Contradiction: Forming of next year's picture that enhances the global Movement. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: On the right hand House watches a government cabinet member assist in developing NT\$250,000 in two companies, while with the left hand House picks up 200 bags of cement inkinded for the new Hai Ou Community Center. Cultural affairs program is held for Lions District 300 C (central Taiwan) Union meeting with over 200 people. President of Asia Tourism Development Corporation is hosted in visit to Hai Ou. Farmers Bank of China makes commitment in principle for providing increased loans to Hai Ou village families for development of their fish ponds.

Internal: Construction is completed on the upstairs porch, adding a new room. House views global film *World of Human Development* with metro guests and during collegium.

Contradiction: Using May to image basic direction of the task in Taiwan during 1979-1980. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Second HDTs opens with 76 participants, 22 faculty and all alumni of the first school in attendance at opening night. Sudtonggan Human Development Association Board elects new president, treasurer and secretary and buys television for preschool and stake meetings out of the industrial profits. Four new rock contracts are signed for San Miguel, Saba Panas and Sudtonggan rock cutters. Cluster preschools experience victory in securing one year of hot snacks supplies in midst of 28 Cluster preschool teachers attending two-day workshop. Basak Mercado graduation program has over 300 in attendance.

Internal: Cebu House celebrates the first House Church in new House/HDTs faculty building behind the training school.

Contradiction: Passing over from passion for past traditions and transferring passion to futuristic village forms. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: House sends out 58 participants to the HDTs from the five villages in the Mountain Cluster. The tractor arrives and starts plowing 30 hectares, 2,500 feet of pipe is laid and the water system is turned on bringing regular water to the mountain top for the first time. Davao City sends 20 truckloads of gravel for the Langub road.

Internal: Global Panchayat visits and tours four new Projects in the first vehicle to make it completely across the mountain ridge trail.

Contradiction: Getting everything ready for the four Consults. (Wk. 6)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Thirty attend an incredible national Guardians meeting. Eight come as official representatives of companies. Three new TM sponsors sign up: Cathay Pacific Airline (1,000,000 yen in tickets), AFIA Insurance and Seven-Up. National Jaycee executive director will help promote TM in 640 chapters.

Internal: Student sojourners begin to lead House meals after a training collegium.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of how to leap from 100 Town Meetings to 1000 Town Meetings. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Joint meeting of village and Women's Association builds corporate plan for managing grain mill. Village workday is focused on common grain mill and preschool renovation. Youth Association erects new signs. Agricultural Guild meets to hear lecture on care of tangerine trees.

## SYDNEY

Internal: Quarter IV battleplan is completed and budget for third draw of USAID is drawn up.

Contradiction: Moving the village toward completion in the midst of completing plans for long-range regional maneuvers. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Extensive inkind network is engaged from paint to Crown Beer in preparation for one year celebration at Kuh Du E Ri.

Internal: Law office permeator's income is boosted by more than half to monthly net of US\$1,650, exceeding total House budget by 25%.

Contradiction: Having only one free finger while three buttons need pushing. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Visit to county chief reveals abundant Project praise, \$6,000 commitment for village truck, assurances of phones and 20 new homes, and his intent to forward special report commending the Project to President Park this fall.

Internal: School enrollment of Park children contains outward-bound dimension as it involves three mile daily hike over the mountain.

Contradiction: Allowing Project celebration plans and needs to enhance rather than foreclose fullness of the multitude of spring tasks in a rural village. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Kyushu continues to go gold as this week House does three more Town Meetings, two in Oita and one in Nagasaki. Also in Nagasaki a global slide show is held for 45 people who donate 30,000 yen in-hand. A Cho meeting set-up in Nagasaki gives House first stronghold.

Internal: House gets some savings on airline tickets and attends some going-away parties and an international party at the school.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between set-up and program implementation while Japan turns gold during the next two months. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: One and half day retreat launches the week with nine Japanese participating in study of Dunne, HRM conversation and work sessions (painting, window washing and garden cleaning). Phone calls come in with two new dates for Town Meetings. TM circuit and Development set-up work yield appointments over the next two weeks.

Internal: House celebrates Japanese "Golden Week," participating in many traditional festivities and events: a wedding, school bazaar, boys day dinner and trip to Kyoto to see the famous rock garden and Golden Temple.

Contradiction: Naming the death ground of number one priority TM and creating the banners, gongs and symbols that ensure the May-June victory. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Fifty people including the entire elder's club participate in traditional Japanese folk dance celebration, the third event in the Monthly March of Happenings in Oyubari. Metro circuit to Obihiro is completed.

Internal: The arrival of spring includes necessary cleaning of the mammoth grounds.

Contradiction: Framing massive move on TM Hokkaido. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: CMA possibilities continue to be explored as letters go out to provincial Sisters of Mercy in New South Wales and House is invited to do a two page article for the Local Government Association Bulletin. Day 1 colleague meeting turns into half day event as several folks drop in for a bite of lunch and missional chat.

Internal: Easter weekend is celebrated with work (retiling kitchen floor, reclaiming vegie garden), canonical hours, church attendance, seeing the film *Black Orpheus* and feasting.

Contradiction: Moving with power in a shifting universe. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Panchayat visit brings together old and new colleagues for a great film night, reignites local Guardian support and elicits referral for Salani from Samoan clergyman.

Internal: Miracles performed by local colleagues as they invite guests, prepare the House and fill the fridge with food, in readiness for the Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Demonstrating the presence of the Perth House while troops are deployed on other fronts. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN—OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Whole community joins in celebration to launch *Year of Australia* at CMA presentation to Hall's Creek. Fishing industry catches three 50-pound baramundi.

Internal: Don Baker is sent out to Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting community images of responsibility and role of the auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Colleagues attending Panchayat visit event are excited by meeting Toronto Guardians Ann and David Patterson, and seeing global film and slides of Murrin Bridge shown by local Guardian Dr. John Murchland. Seven more Community Meetings are done in midst of which House discovers host committee chairman from CM held in Pt. Pirie three years ago holding great forums in his district.

Internal: *Way of All the Earth* study is a highlight of Panchayat visit, affirming what House is about.

Contradiction: Configuring troops to sustain them in the area mission with three more state campaigns still to go. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Community Meeting Australia golding troops, Murrin Bridge auxiliary, zone Development teams, and global Development systems task force converge on Melbourne for Area Sydney Council and experience new resolve to complete Year of Australia.

Internal: The miracle of feeding and housing 34 troops is enabled by the tireless work of the visiting Porter family.

Contradiction: Manning command post phone with the best wisdom of field re-maneuvering in Tasmania while all troops are deployed. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Guardian event for 40 to watch global film and meet Panchayat includes the Deputy Director General of Health, UN representatives, Parliamentary, university and professional representatives and public services.

Internal: Panchayat and House go to "Music Hall From Turn of Century" at Canberra Repertory Theater to celebrate a week's work and laugh until sides split.

Contradiction: Continuing authorization with almost everyone back to CMA and HDPs. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: House holds Easter weekend RS-1 with Uniting Church Youth Group at Surfer's Paradise. House welcomes Panchayat with home-brewed beer. May Hancock and Jago family are among colleagues attending HDP movie. Sr. Anne Marie Kinnane of Rockhampton participates with House in two-day session with Panchayat, including fantastic Brisbane seafood feast.

Internal: House gets "spit 'n polish" for Panchayat.

Contradiction: Securing consistent day care so self-support can go on. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE-MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: Community "Coonchie" body transfers funds towards industry wages, and 28 community men are present and sign up for jobs. Floor tiles catalyze home management and interior decorating program while new youth curriculum plans to focus "Creative Creatures" maneuver.

Internal: Four adults travel to Melbourne for Area Council and return with Porters and Kim Thornton.

Contradiction: Accelerating production marketing systems to take advantage of community readiness. (Wk. 7)

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: The experiment of having stake and guild meetings on the same evening increases participation of people in the showplace.

Internal: Showplace women surprise entire House with 5:00 a.m. birthday serenade (Marshallese tradition) for Rachel Jones.

Contradiction: Locating the key that releases training events through established structures. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: Visible signs of community activity are building a new kitchen for the women's committee and a new willingness of cooperation with the district nurse visiting and talking with women about regular visits.

Internal: In the midst of Panchayat visitation preparation the House takes a day of discontinuity by touring the island, including beaches, waterfalls and a picnic.

Contradiction: Discerning the focused push to alter the stance of "I can wait for someone else to do it." (Wk. 7)

**SAN FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Marin City, in the midst of turmoil, remembering the Town Meeting in 1977 as the only time they were able to work together and get something accomplished, calls to schedule a Town Meeting which they set up in a week.

Internal: After wild slumber party in the Knutson room, Emerging Generation brainstorm and do MMM miracles to care for House.

Contradiction: Creating the corporate context in the midst of being scattered by task assignments. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: Preschool opens, 8:00 to 3:00 five days a week, with 17 students and four full-time staff. State licensing inspector comments, "This is the fastest licensing process I've ever been involved in and with all those calls from Representative Duffy's office, you've really got strong support."

Internal: Visiting Redlands youth group joins House, after a hard day's work, in evening of games and relaxation.

Contradiction: Pushing aside activities and making time for comprehensive planning for Quarter IV. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP**

External: Walls come tumbling down on old blacksmith shop that has marred the landscape for many years. The local Future Homemakers of America Club agrees to sponsor the youth program.

Internal: House joins populace in annual rite of opening day of fishing season and celebrates House Church with platter of fresh-caught trout.

Contradiction: Increasing community participation in community activities by shifting focus from individual concerns to community concerns. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Regional Council called "The Time of our Lives," a retreat for those who care, combines review of freedom and church sections of RS-1 with seminary and sodality from first three weeks of ecclesiola and six of the Beatitudes conversations and gets largest turnout all year. Regional planning is accomplished in shortest time ever after Week II of depth contexting and perspective. Highlight is Daily Office and baptism of Elizabeth Mariko Robertson as rehearsal of covenant is reexperienced by all.

Internal: Reports from Area and Guardians meetings and ecclesiola study which looks at the prolegemena from Consult documents reground doing.

Contradiction: Getting missional contradiction articulated with clarity which can focus the new-found advantages from the film showings and the Regional Council. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Invitations to Richgrove *Milagro de Mayo* are sent to all colleagues. Four-county saturation strategy is launched by all three California Houses in Richgrove.

Internal: House gets spirit boost in Week II at Richgrove.

Contradiction: Turning end of year slump into launching pad. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: Ten TMs in five days bring total to 21 done and 19 set up in first two districts in Arizona 120. This doubles total TMs done in Arizona since 1975. Carload returns from Santa Cruz workday with sunburns and sore muscles. DES comes through with printing. House receives permit from City of Phoenix Solicitation Board to develop money and ink.

Internal: Betty Hummer and Mark Jewell arrive; Betty does five TMs and workday in Santa Cruz.

Contradiction: Finding a winning image of how to do the next 40 TMs. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP**

External: The Miracle Month of May begins with 15 people working daily on Santa Cruz village miracle, week of intensified research for farm and well equipment, and setting up laundromat books with accountant from Denver.

Internal: House welcomes Hale Prather from Operations Centrum and Robert Manners from Denver for Miracle Month of May.

Contradiction: Phasing and framing of farm operations for next three weeks. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY**

External: Funds raised for Guardian participation from Cusick and food is inkinded for auxiliary.

Internal: Metro hosts colleagues from Cusick HDP and are moved to assist on needs there.

Contradiction: Breaking loose local participation and spiritual nurture in a time of aridity. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

External: House mails newsletter with focus on Trash Barro selling and HDP consultant recruitment, and schedules locally-hosted slide show.

Internal: Little League becomes vehicle of parish engagement as House member becomes team mother.

Contradiction: Creating tactical actions within permeation assignments during Merry Month of May. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP**

External: Community gathers in store to watch Charles Lester as he represents Cannon Ball Industries on television talk show. Ground is broken for this year's planting of the truck farm. Elmer Shell Track goes to Indiahoma to celebrate with them their first anniversary.

Internal: Whole House works with community to put out a prairie fire on the windiest day of the week.

Contradiction: Doing the tactics, not defending them. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Key appointment is held with State Director of Local Affairs and gets foot in the door for state agency support.

Internal: House teams and tasks get reorganized with Youth taking responsibility for food buying and planning of menus.

Contradiction: Doing the creative waiting necessary to position for next year's acceleration. (Wk. 7)

**EDMONTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: The whole House and Solomon Shiu attend Area Council in Edmonton, then the council report is highlight of colleagues' meeting.

Internal: First step in reducing House budget is made with ink of five cases of juice, one box of oranges, two boxes of tomatoes and 500 tea bags.

Contradiction: Making regional plans in the midst of ambiguity relative to area picture and troop demands. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER**

External: Panchayat reception responses flow in while six appointments launch local recruitment maneuver to discover potential wellsprings of troops.

Internal: House prepares for Panchayat visit by inking a meal at Mother Tuckers, one of Western Canada's most talked-about restaurants.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum on the quarter's maneuvers while ensuring sophisticated, well-attended Panchayat event. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP**

External: Craft Co-op member and one auxiliary staff spend three days in Fairbanks and come back with \$643 worth of craft orders and a multitude of future possibilities. Tanana Chiefs promise funding for summer marketing trip to Anchorage, Seattle and San Francisco. "Farmer" Morris Morgan from Tanana Chiefs comes to village to train people in gardening skills. Flats, seeds, soil, hoes, rakes are inked and roto-tiller promised. Several people have already staked out gardens and turned them by hand in preparation. The Village Corporation Store goes up faster than greased lightning. Completion is scheduled in four weeks. Youth group is launched with seed planting, races, softball, house painting and picnic. ICA staff serve as consultants in creating new accounting system for village phone use.

Internal: House plans new strategies in the midst of turning into a revolving door, with village people coming and going.

Contradiction: Keeping Project plates spinning in the midst of the essential day-to-day chores and spirit life of both House and village that impinge on time. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON**

External: Visit with Metis and Indian Friendship Center results in firm date for CYF. Future looks good after meeting with "Celebrate Saskatchewan" Committee for 75 year anniversary in 1980.

Internal: Temporary Wall of Wonder is re-done into permanent art form in time for lengthy, fascinating ecclesiola resulting in new insights into recruiting for the Global Servant Force.

Contradiction: Weaving recruiting thrust into on-going program activity to provide one focus. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP**

External: Environment intensification week includes three meetings on school landscaping, new housing, and municipality services, three workdays on Vogar Products cleanup, store corner brushing, and Project office construction. Three business signs are inked and major work on leadership development begins through collegiums and extensive visiting.

Internal: Fine auxiliary celebration caps off week of environment work.

Contradiction: Creating the leadership development plan which will enhance the recent shifts in Project participation. (Wk. 7)

**HOUSTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Thirty of Houston's influential people attend the film in the downtown Sheraton Hotel. People are deeply moved by the film and by unsolicited witnesses about the work of the ICA. Experiment with block Town Meetings is underway through nearby SHAPE Community Center.

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to be a powerful happening each week.

Contradiction: Finding the methods to engage patrons and potential Guardians in doing what needs to be done. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP**

External: First year celebration is a huge success. Lt. Governor Spencer Bernard, State Representative Bob Harper, Lawton Mayor, Lawton Chamber of Commerce and other dignitaries are present for community's event. Lt. Governor hopes that Indiahoma HDP will "spread like measles across the state."

Internal: Elmer Shell Track from Inyan Wakagapi and Guardians from across region come to Indiahoma to celebrate.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum gained in preparation for first year celebration, i.e. build the grocery store. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP**

External: Health issues forum is held with 23 attending. The group plans health caretakers in each of five stakes and lays groundwork for part-time clinic. Dr. Burt Dyson assists in moving caretakers. Asherton gets commitment for \$500,000 block grant for sewage system. Cinco de Mayo celebration in Asherton is a big success.

Internal: Mark Welch arrives in time for Cinco de Mayo parade.

Contradiction: Encouraging local leaders to assume responsibility and yet maintaining necessary quality of work. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY**

External: Preparation for Indiahoma year-end celebration continues with Roger in Indiahoma for a week and the entire House present for a workday there.

Internal: Colleague leads seminary as House continues with great ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Setting priorities to release maximum results from limited time and troops. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: Eleven colleagues from Dallas participate in the first year celebration in Indianahoma with many Oklahoma VIP's and community leaders. North Haven UMC commits \$600 gift to ICA work. ACTION requests local staff to do training of VISTA project supervisors in Dallas.

Internal: In a week of flooding and tornados, ecclesiola provides real nurture to the Dallas-Fort Worth cadre illuminating the need for every community to experience the dynamics of ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers and timelines which cover all priorities of self-support, covering geography and Development in Dallas. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP**

External: Twelve TMs, one CYF and 34 planning meetings are set in final two state districts. PFT group (social commission) elects officers in step towards incorporation. Proposal is submitted to ACTION for TM: Mississippi 1979-80 for \$104,000. Ruth Wilson, Powell and Roper dine with National ACTION executive, Barbara Sugarman, who says Mrs. Carter is much impressed with TM: Mississippi. Governor's invitation to State Assembly goes out to mayors. Dramatic planning meetings are key, ensuring local recruitment in last month in which 40 of 42 planning meetings yield a TM.

Internal: Jim, Olive Ann and Jon Slotta arrive, while Eloise Patton moves to Memphis for next maneuver.

Contradiction: Scheduling 41 events into 52 available slots, over against Wednesday prayer nights, baccalaureate nights, and Memorial Day, without being too overconfident. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: TM set-up call uncovers black colleague, Sidney Duplessis, with Fifth City experience 10 years ago, who has carried Iron Man and imaginal methods into Desire project of 65,000 people through a community center and newspaper.

Internal: Pilot retreat at Caritas with 24 colleagues from six states eagerly and profoundly experiments with profound depths of life with John Dunne's meditative counsel.

Contradiction: Turning interior panic into creative action in face of public gaze. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Memphis based team bats 1,000 in holding 10 planning meetings, setting up five for next week and setting up nine planning meetings for next week.

Internal: Joseph Vincent McCabe is born on May 4, 1979 weighing seven pounds, seven ounces.

Contradiction: Capturing the present momentum while not over extending commitment to this region. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Magnolia Month Maneuver continues with TM nods form three towns. Colombia High School and PTA work out practices for CYF.

Internal: Dunne study is high point of ecclesiola. House sends letter to Academy participant, Ann Kidd, complete with dogwood flowers.

Contradiction: Procuring local rider for TM program. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP**

External: Framing visit to Carolina Power and Light Regional Manager uncovers the fact that the President of CP&L is on Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation Board of Directors and

particularly interested in the Gibson Project. Regional Manager spends half day in Gibson, unknown to Project staff, just talking to the people about the Project. All reports are positive. CP&L wants to help with downtown beautification by removing power wires and poles and installing new street lights.

Internal: Powell's extended family visit for the weekend is culminated by Saturday night celebration with black and white represented and a workshop on innovative housing.

Contradiction: Producing visible signs as well as building foundations and breaking open possibilities for Gibson Day. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: The Bainbridge (South Georgia) Maneuver includes two fine CYFs, two showings of the global film and an Imaginal Education event with health workers and church school teachers. Back in Orlando a training session is held with youth for CYF leadership, a CYF is set up for Seminole County and the Chairman of the Seminole County Commissioners is most helpful.

Internal: More than 40 people crowd into an Open House for the slide show and facility tour. The gift to our work of a new '79 VW Rabbit humbles and dazzles us with new possibilities it represents.

Contradiction: Wedging open positive regional responses over the next 18 months in subsequent strongholds. (Wk. 7)

### **CHICAGO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: In one week blitz, Development raises \$109,000 toward closing April. Merry Month of May victory charts by area are posted in Campaign Lounge. Kinney HDP inkinds enough xerographic paper for the GRA.

Internal: Nexus sends out Danny O'Neill to Widen HDP for mural creation and welcomes Joe and Araceli Mathews.

Contradiction: Creating symbology that makes May a magic month rather one to be "tuffed" out. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP**

External: City garden tractor from International Harvester tills seven gardens in two hours. Repaired roto-tiller and left-over railroad ties enable kick-off of gardens with 32 on-site.

Internal: The scattered troops dynamic hits hard as deadlines and May demands troops, and RS-1 and CSIII A impact others.

Contradiction: Deciding when and where to claim victories when ground is steadily gained on a broad front. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA-LORIMOR HDP**

External: As the entire state of Iowa experiences tornadoes, Lorimor, too, has a tornado of its own with bingo, a disco, and shopping on Friday night, a youth environment survey to use for planning workdays, a visit from VISTA and the guild setting up a Spring workday schedule.

Internal: Week II is spent reflecting on and evaluating the past quarter, planning Quarter IV and working on the backyard.

Contradiction: Using valuable set-up time for Spring while "waiting" for community leadership to pick up back-up roles. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: The *World of Human Development* is shown in four strongholds in a four-day period.

Internal: House computer prints letters for strongholds and the new press and plate maker are in use.

Contradiction: Creating corporate data care systems. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Six events, including Town Meetings, social methods presentations, LENS seminar and others are held. A LENS seminar is submitted to Minnesota Department of Administration which leaves only one or two state departments which have not yet had a forum or seminar conducted by the ICA.

Internal: The first LENS pedagogy to be held outside of Nexus since the new wave of LENS seminars began is held with 15 attentive participants.

Contradiction: Keeping manpower covenants increasing at the same rate that the programs are booked in order to do a thorough job of impact and follow-up on all fronts. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: House works on three fronts: Mill Shoals support, Illinois state framing and urban impact with signal breakthrough in establishing reciprocal exchange between St. Louis and Mill Shoals.

Internal: Continued presence of house guests and ecclesiola enlivens internal life.

Contradiction: Keeping three fronts going full force while focusing on the one priority for the month and building the overall strategies. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: End of a three-week maneuver feels like a circus with many rings: leadership emerges to coordinate Memorial Day celebration with 23 at community meeting and new VISTA sworn in; massive cleanup and beautification across town with five welcome signs erected; four churches, town board, school board and Raritan put signatures on formal invitation, with 750 Voices mailed across continent; two visitors from Green Giant occasion HDP authorization breaks open; neighborhood care is intensified through two visits to every household; and, in the health care arena, 19 women show up for first exercise class.

Internal: House is struck by knowledgeable presence of two visitors from Green Giant who are deeply impacted by HDP.

Contradiction: Always having or checking with a shadow and making Memorial Day celebration prep fun. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP**

External: Five stakes meet once again and plan first workday of the Spring. Duluth city planners ask ICA guidance in planning public meetings and training leadership. Kinney Custom Industries is called to Minneapolis to receive first order instructions and one-third of check.

Internal: House entertains five Indian engineers who are training at U. S. Steel and are excited to hear about Maharashtra.

Contradiction: Re-inventing the hard miracles that bring vision to reality and belief. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Shirley St. John spends three days in Fifth City working on a public relations strategy for the State of Illinois for the Merry Month of May. The House begins calling campaign to entice colleagues and friends to spend weekends in Lorimor.

Internal: Inking hits a new high after old sources attend the global film and receive invitation to join in Lorimor during the month of May.

Contradiction: Fascinating TWC with all the possibilities of this moment while planning the fall maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Fifty people from five states gather Week II in Hartford City. Indiana for RS-1, CSIIIA and children's RS-1

delivering new colleagues, and decisions about HDP participation. House sends representative to World Council of Churches Conference on Development Education at Christian Theological Seminary, meeting national and international framing figures. Meeting with Indianapolis YWCA World Mutual Service Committee sets up first GWF for 1980-81.

Internal: April Fortune magazine includes 10-page ad on the *Human Settlement Revolution* in the Philippines which has a very familiar ring and indicates the impact of LENS and HDP signs.

Contradiction: Providing better backup so that block association Town Meetings happen when originally scheduled and Louisville stronghold is completed. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

External: Marian Karpoff is sent out to Kinney HDP for Miracle Month of May. Mark Dove joins Panchayat visitation in Canada for 10 days. Impact events, including Proctor and Gamble LENS, reach 440 people.

Internal: Youth cluster have roles in high school musical and all the House attends.

Contradiction: Articulating the "urgent now" character of awakening events to metro colleagues in the midst of Spring demands. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: House kicks off the quarter with a CYF in Madison Heights involving 150 students from three high schools and a key Town Meeting in the Bay City stronghold attended by economic, political and cultural authorization.

Internal: House holds first rotating Saturday morning ecclesiola at Guardian's home to enable region to prepare for Global Research Assembly.

Contradiction: Operating out of convenience rather than missional need. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: West Central Town Meeting plenary report requests HDP site in Central area—"the poorest of the poor" in Cleveland.

Internal: Bushman family send out to Salani HDP in Western Samoa is occasion for new decisions for many.

Contradiction: Finding time to make maximum advantage of all the last chips. (Wk. 7)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: House members lead a forum for tenants of 56 Seventh Avenue, New York, which results in the formation of a tenants' association and the practical plan to organize corporate enablement of building services during building service employees' strike.

Internal: The collegium rehearsing the journey of the Summers stimulates discussion of the role of Summer '79 and anticipation of dealing with the Institute's new public prominence.

Contradiction: Doing adequate debriefing and evaluation that articulates new position and then acting on it. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Four more dates are set in region, ensuring a jubilant June.

Internal: The poetry of Dunne gets turned into truth as it manifests itself in collegium, Daily Office theme and ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Orchestrating tasks with time to maximize results. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Colleagues' participation in worldwide PSU as part of regular metro meetings generates enthusiasm. New stronghold is opened as Pendleton in Niagra County schedules TM.

Internal: House focuses on catching up on finance reports, and participates in track meets, rehearses for high school play and does inkind blitz.

Contradiction: Building models to focus efforts of last half of quarter. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Contradiction: Modifying House structures and assignments in order to better release generalship. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP**

External: Mayor Marion Barry personally calls to say House is in Community Development Area 5, which means Ivy City is now eligible for all community programs and funds available to the district—advocates are at work! Twenty-six supporters from the business community come for lunch.

Internal: With 28 guests in and out of the House, collegiums are key spirit events in sharing wisdom, vision and planning for summer.

Contradiction: Building generals in the battle of May. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: The Miracle Month of May moves beyond maintenance to motivating murals. An abandoned store wall now tells the story of Widen's past, present and eternal presence.

Internal: The front door is painted just before the television cameras arrive; the door now says, "Widen Human Development Project, Auxiliary House."

Contradiction: Creating the new while the temptation to be consumed by maintenance is overwhelming. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: The Miracle Month of May motivates to move to Ivy City to work.

Internal: First-hand report of the John Dunne visit to Nexus personalizes and humanizes *The Way of All the Earth*.

Contradiction: Focusing the state-wide strategy on the Pennsylvania campaign in a way that capitalizes on present advantages and resources. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Thirty-five attend wine and cheese showing of the global film at Dick and Ethel Smyres' house in New Jersey. A man invited that day says that he is looking for a way to spend two years in the Third World.

Internal: A fierce soccer game signals the end of the set-up of ten positional awakening events and the beginning of the Miracle Month of May.

Contradiction: Articulating the new position and acting effectively on it. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: The village is full for a special Saturday Town Meeting when around the corner comes the miracle team of Westre and

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

Internal: The House hosts Bob Booher and Jim Troxel for two days, and travels to Starks Week II for the workday.

Contradiction: Weaving a frame of iron support for state funding proposal. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. Cambridge Town Meeting, Binghamton Town Meeting assembly and Albany Metro debriefing wind up quarter's Town Meeting campaign with two clusters of events held and one Assembly yet to go.

Internal: Looking ahead to next quarter through collegiums on "Ten Considerations in Community Reformulation" and quarter vision enables nonchalance with core and releases their creativity.

Contradiction: Shifting single focus of energy on CVF, Ltd. to multifaceted spring adventures without losing CVF momentum. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: The executive director of a New Hampshire Human Services Coordinating Council says yes to a series of TMs in the fall.

Internal: Clean-up of the mini-park adjacent to the House catalyzes the participation by next door neighbor.

Contradiction: Working through a campaign night GSF dynamic without getting stuck in a particular structure. (Wk. 5)

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Round of visits with people in many different arenas sets up yields access to Esplanade polis clergy, luncheon with authorization clergy for Panchayat, global film show with Canada World Youth national staff, translation of GWF brochure into Greek, French Evening at the ICA and hopeful possibility of provincial Chamber of Commerce authorization.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

Internal: The global fast adds special dimension to ecclesiola highlighted by having Bill Gooch lead the study.

Contradiction: Getting what is going done, while creating ways and time to start new thrusts. (Wk. 7)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

Contradiction: Creating strategies that emphasize human development. (Wk. 7)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Celebration of end of Consult month on Monday night encourages reflection and resolve for leadership cadre. Regional leadership indicates willingness to come to Lorne for parts of this month, also.

Internal: Community decision to lead causes House to work on shifting images from gunning Project programs to training Samurai warriors.

Contradiction: Building rhythms, completing legal back-up, thinking through journey models before the kairotic moment of cadre commitment moves. (Wk. 7)

## **CARACAS**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: In the midst of chapel walls rising rapidly through community effort, the collection of the IADB report focuses the community on victory.

Internal: Global team, Kaye Hayes and Harry Wainwright, brings stories from other Projects and Rafael returns from Europe.

Contradiction: Using chapel cooperative effort to dispel the Cano Negro myth that "we done work together." (Wk. 7)

## **BUENOS AIRES**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: First economically viable model for operating the rabbit project is presented in a collegium by the local manager, and represents a change in policy by the institution backing the rabbit industry. A sub-contract for making curtains is a breakthrough event and is a direct result of contacts made in the GWF. Prospective preschoolers and their mothers participate in a presentation of the program given by the local preschool teachers and view slides on Easter Island courtesy of a Santiago Guardian. Family photos are taken in Sector 1 helping solidify family and sector identity.

Internal: The installation of a Franklin-type stove constructed from an oil drum by a local welder changes frosty mornings into toasty ones and demonstrates a more efficient method of heating local homes.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary deeds without waiting for legalization and surviving the consequences. (Wk. 6)

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: At a specially-called community meeting, the community hears the plan for electricity that will be put in before the end of the year, and asks questions. Paulo, the EMATER (government agriculture) man gives talk on home gardens and helps to plant the Stake 4 home garden. First baby-weighing day in community draws mothers and infants never before engaged in Project programs. Dr. Marcos comes and vaccinates 130 against tuberculosis. Potatoes are planted and ground readied for bean crop at the agricultural experimental station. Home garden class starts with great excitement as 35 construct bamboo fence and put up stake signs.

Internal: Four travel to Rio for final prep of ITI, leaving the Project without women.

Contradiction: Doing practical enablement and ITI back-up while bringing six guilds into being during heavy do-ment quarter in the Project. (Wk. 7)

## **HAVANA**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: National Commercial Bank agrees to "being on the hook" for IADB loan, and to help train local loan committee. Development banks \$1,100 Jamaican. Noel and Verlene attend synods of three denominations for ITI recruitment. Tool pool management training is completed.

Internal: Easter discontinuity allows repainting guest room and collegium floor, and all return with resurrected vision.

Contradiction: Launching a quarter that has already begun. (Wk. 5)

## **MEXICO CITY**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

## **LIMA**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, ink push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Internal: Access to nearby telephone simplifies Development calling and Saturday barhopping celebration with cadre colleague provides encounter with Peruvian folk music.

Contradiction: Dealing with inadequate practical arrangements in the face of ever-mounting missional demands. (Wk. 6)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports treks are sent to Manila and Cebu. The Mitsubishi Oil Company grants 500,000 yen in Japan. Minister K. T. Li calls Taipei House to confirm his raising US\$6,000 for Hai Ou. First interim report on the 25 villages is presented to EEC for release of the second \$120,000. One Belgium religious order gives \$1,500 while the Ministry of Dutch Culture gives \$7,700 to ICA programs. The first draw of the \$37,800 grant for Arizona TM is received this week. Two press kits are created in Chicago: one of positive articles and one of guidelines to follow when working with the press. The key contradiction lies in the arena of formalizing the new mode of operation this is already emerging.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports that First International Ecumenical Conference on the Meaning of Human Suffering creates shocking insights on the state of the Church as it relates to the world today. John Dunne site visit creates occasion for fine Nexus event and dialogue. The ICA annual report moves toward completion, an extraordinary Phase I campsite for summer releases curriculum planning, and significant work on retreat and modules in the field enlightens the edge. Implosions are set off by article, "Revolution in the Village," as collegium data begins to roll in from the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the underlying common standpoint of the mission in order to focus the summer effectively.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum reports Singapore catches up on bills and progresses on first Malaysian audit and Australian audit. Brussels works on grant reports. Chicago sends out staff to Majuro, Sydney and Montreal to assist in financial management plus staff to support North American Merry Month of May. International Training Center is dressed up with plants and flowers at entrance and around parking lot. Band intensifies as task forces convene around tasks related to audits and grants. The key contradiction lies in the arena of gearing up to meet accelerating demands in the field relative to financial management.

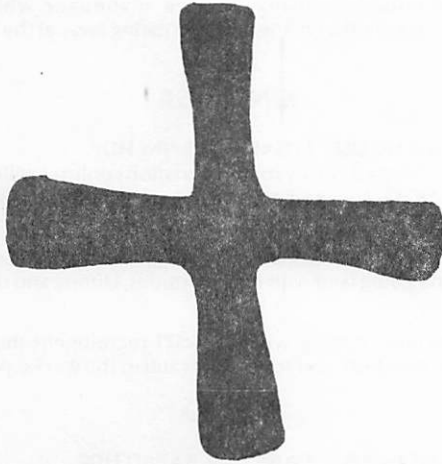
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Brussels Nexus is represented at Benelux polis coverage, U.K. polis coverage and HDP acceleration. Luncheon at Chicago Nexus for wives of Swiss and German Consul Generals results in film event set for International Women's Club and women of consulate corps, and GWF set for September. GSD post updates Chicago's tracking board and discovers solid economic victories in two-thirds of the HDPs. ## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Local Sports Club decides to hold social to raise funds for the Powerhouse, which they hope to take over for a sports center, and are ready to assume responsibility for lease from Port of London Authority. Visit with American Ambassador is very favorable; he agrees to provide introduction to strategic multinational corporation executives and Nuffield Foundation. Two more CYF dates are set by the Terrific Trio clusters.

Internal: House experiences national election and Margaret Thatcher win as Prime Minister as historical firsts.

Contradiction: Shifting awakening campaign strategies require Development repositioning. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: One Town Meeting is done and two more dates set. One Town Meeting is set by phone. Two are assigned to London and Manchester for area maneuvers. Fifty India contribution letters are sent with the new journal to key colleagues.

Internal: The House participates in and observes a week of the U.K.'s national elections.

Contradiction: Using the phone with speed and effectivity for rapid Town Meeting set-up within a given time span. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: The Miracle Month of May begins with village entrance miracle—a new welcome sign, village directory, white stone road edging and repairs plus a beautiful new mural. Stake calls determine future miracles and line up muscle power.

Internal: House watches on TV the drama of the election of first woman head of government in the West.

Contradiction: Building momentum around Management Board to enable articulation of their victories. (Wk. 8)

Four colleagues lend telephones, and two more volunteer time.

Internal: Steve Evans, now fully recovered, is participating, and Paul Dyhr gives a collegium on TM pitch based on Xerox sales method.

Contradiction: Creating the poetry and style that will convey the power of Town Meeting over the telephone. (Wk. 6)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House sends B. Parker to join D. Mathio and M. Guillot to complete the Benelux Waltz Town Meeting Maneuver.

Internal: John Wenge joins House for fast, taco breakfast feast and the transformation of two more blighted areas.

Contradiction: Dancing the thin line between symbolic rehearsal and practical engagement. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Barbara Alerding addresses the superiors general of the religious orders in Rome at Justice and Peace Commission seminar on the Year of the Child. Development sets more than ten appointments. Late quarter's planning session maps out the next ten weeks in Termine and Italy.

Internal: Gottfried, a carpenter from Berlin is welcomed as Order: Ecumenical at House Church and leaves for Termine to help with the woodworking industry.

Contradiction: Keeping the passion alive when the sun shines on the mountains left to climb. (Wk. 8)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Marathon management meeting and 15-strong community planning days symbolize emerging community iron, while news of ink drums and borehole from Lever Brothers and Taylor Woodrow are received with glee. Larentis technical truck arrives and eight sweaty hours later streetlights blaze into life again after Lenten pause. CIDA site visit impacts Director with Project seriousness.

Internal: A week of glorious victory is celebrated on the occasion of an auxiliary birthday with fabulous Chinese feast at Mr. K. P. Yu's house in the Nichemtex compound, and a romp in his swimming pool.

Contradiction: Setting arenas of responsibility concretely on the shoulders of leaders and employees. (Wk. 5)

## BRUSSELS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Global Development and Global Management band from India and Brussels publish two complete accounting reports and partially finish another relative to grants funding, as the final copies arrive just as Donna McClesky and Phil Dowsett leave for India.

Internal: House hosts two guests for ecclesiola and study of *The Way of All the Earth*, again grounding radical methods.

Contradiction: Standing in the global/local tension. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Charleroi stronghold moves forward. Netherlands polises are completed, bringing troops back to work on Flanders.

Internal: Collegium on strongholds illuminates contradictions.

Contradiction: Discerning criteria for stronghold launch. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Class of missionaries at Mill Hill Missionary Institute participates in Town Meeting on an African village, occasioning deep vocational reflection for themselves, and completing the 36th (and last!) Netherlands polis. TM with representatives of Catholic Rural Women in Arnhem "takes a bridge" into a new national network.

Internal: House gets a permit to work in the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Positioning for next year with all polises done. (Wk. 8)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: *Gemeindeforum* teams return victorious, not only with awakening happenings but with developed money in hand to cover their expenses. Largest number of corporation appointments ever are set in Frankfurt, done by an American, speaking only English. Folker Franz, Frankfurt colleague, phones to excitedly report that a businessman saw his name on the brochure and phoned him for his recommendation. When asked if he had told a good story, he replied, "I told the truth—he was very impressed and you will be hearing from his company."

Internal: Paula Philbrook and Ken Whitney meet the Great German Gamble team for a day of continental planning while Brian Williams and Berthold Schwaiger continue the Frankfurt Development push, injecting new spirit into internal life forms.

Contradiction: Spurring House and others on to match the pace with which the opportunities of service are coming. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Kreuzberg Ost first model house is on the move with eight-week model on renter's participation, including Turkish house meeting next weekend, *hinterhoff* (backyard) renovation and festival, and public entrance and stairway beautification. Local community now assumes responsibility for all KHDP finances.

Internal: Whole House is learning how to do bookkeeping while bookkeeper is away on another assignment.

Contradiction: Focusing on one maneuver while the immediacies of other maneuvers are eating away at the House. (Wk. 8)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Second visit by Ford Foundation confirms willingness to fund HDTs, Village Forums, and six additional villages in district in 1979-80.

Internal: Ecclesiola is again the highlight of the week, starting earlier and going later with the Beatitudes, Dunne and the Wall of Wonder.

Contradiction: Putting wheels on ITI recruitment this week with new brochure and mailing lists still in the works. (Wk. 7)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Abdul-Hamid, village Project director, is sent out to Nairobi HDTs at guild meeting led totally by village leadership. "Cream of the crop" leadership is sent to global training, as permission to build new community center on median symbolizes maturing trust by local and government authorities for Project intent.

Internal: Said Risgalla and Farah Hanna, first village ICA staff members to attend global training structure outside Egypt, are sent out and the vacuum catalyzes decisions by other young Egyptians to join the staff.

Contradiction: Finding the death ground that is of significance to the villagers in order to catalyze rapid village development in the economic and social arenas. (Wk. 8)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Feast of nations with national food and traditional dancing highlights the glorious week of awakening and the heritage excursion for the Human Development Training School in Kawangware. Visits to the national game park, the museum to view the origin of man, the national theater to see Kenyan struggle for independence, the Bomas of Kenya where traditional life is portrayed, the viewing the *Seven Faces of Dr. Lao* and the most fantastic Village Meeting hold the week.

Internal: Staff experiences the greatest night club in the world as the six tribal groupings from across the continent serve their festive dinner and dramatize their heritage in dances and song.

Contradiction: Giving form to that which creates the Iron Man on the African continent to care for the world. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Seventy percent of the community engages in completion of the pipe-line trench. The first three ferro-cement water jars (500 and 1,000 gallons) are completed in Stake 5.

Internal: Evening prayers are now taking deeper root in the House.

Contradiction: Transporting enough materials to build four water tanks per week in Stake 5. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Campaign of 25 gathers momentum as industry loans are secured, House foundations are laid, site visits held and divisions meet with Global Panchayat.

Internal: Nexus sends three to Global Management Centrum band meeting, two to Global Operations Centrum band meeting, as auditors complete one month's work in Bombay.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the 2,500 to create the forms and images to carry through the 232. (Wk. 10)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Houses focuses on Development with local troops and Guardians developing a car from Delhi Cloth Mills and 12,000 rupees to begin community center construction. Brick road construction begins.

Internal: A motorcycle is purchased for Sikror Project.

Contradiction: Creating system for getting developed money working in the village. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Chairman of Nadlapur's adopting company has good visit to Project. Government gives go-ahead on construction of women's building. Bank and government subsidy agency set January 3 as Loan Sanction Day in the village. Pre-school curriculum is revamped. Domestic water supply model and Stake 5 lighting are accelerated by electricity sanction. Walls are completed to model house for *harigans*. Material for preschool uniforms is purchased to be sewn by sewing class.

Internal: Auxiliary member, Mallaram, visits home and Gilmour family arrives to take up Nadlapur assignment.

Contradiction: Symbolizing maturity and integrity of Human Development Project by obtaining blanket and rope market. (Wk. 2)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: TELCO (Tata Engineering and Locomotive Company) agrees to sponsor Calcutta Buffer for one year in the amount of US\$30,000. Nexus priors join area team for final negotiations and site selection. Village of Chainpur, 50 percent Adivasis and 50 percent other classes, 38 kilometers from Jamshedpur, is chosen as demonstration Project. After a meeting with leaders and villagers, decision is made to send five villagers to the HDTS which starts on April 15th.

Internal: Week-long Continental Council in Sevagram Ashram reveals new self-consciousness of operating as a continent and provides fresh motivity for capturing the victory of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Creating the design of events that focuses power into do-ment of the Project from now until Consult. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Lunch with Robert and Elanor Welty, parents of Christina Clark, provides again the great gift of the Guardian dynamic. Mr. and Mrs. Welty plan to visit Sungai Lui where he was part of the Consult team two years ago.

Internal: Nexus welcomes Mauno Wilkkinen on world bicycle trek who left his home of Finland January, 1972 and plans to be gone until January, 1982.

Contradiction: Engaging futurically in a month of helpless waiting for decision on registration in Singapore. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Site visits from Chief Minister's representative, Ko-Nelayan (state fishing cooperative) director, Sarawak fisheries expert, headmen from three neighboring villages and representative from district office mark demonstration power. Intense week-long training as part of area impact trek results in eight MTMs (Town Meeting Malaysia), one village GWF and 32 people trained. Consensus is reached on phasing of MTM in Sabah and is ready to go to the district for approval. Two more units of the floating fish farm are completed and new plans for office, storehouse, jetty with generator are approved by Ko-Nelayan, with building supplies to be purchased this week.

Internal: House sends out Marge Tomlinson after one week of MTM (GCF) training.

Contradiction: Creating new community structures to care for new activities. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Village meeting decides it is time to form a village company and elect the Secretariat in a village-wide meeting. Tutorial classes, increased with history and geography, are taught by youth. Village research teams go to Kuala Lumpur to check out getting fertilizer in bulk at wholesale, getting a rice mill, purchasing three more hand tractors for rice fields, and getting 10 typewriters on loan for a class of 20 who are waiting. Youth paint the inside and outside of agriculture complex, plow and level the surrounding area, pull weeds, and help plant 300 banana trees in the field behind. Site visit is made by a German fertilizer company which wants to do a demonstration plot. Johnson & Johnson grants US\$2,500.

Internal: Special visitors are Christina Clark's parents, Robert and Elanor Welty, who are impressed by the changes since Robert was here for the Consult and by the fact that the villagers remember him.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on village's new understanding that not only appointed leaders of the village can make decisions. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Sub-district leader (Camat) installs secretariat and strongly affirms the work of the Project and the presence of the ICA. New auxiliary nurse visits every home and cures many sicknesses. Marathon is held on USAID financial reporting.

Internal: House sends out Pomo Prawirokoesoemo to Sungai Lui, paying his own way.

Contradiction: Maneuvering transition to self-reliance and self-support in village as crucial parts of USAID grant come to an end. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Old stage is removed to clear village entrance way for Panchayat visit. Bubun grid is moved to complement symbolism of House. Eight Department of Education officials open sewing class. Contact is made to arrange opening of mechanic training course. Guardians' meeting at the home of lumber tycoon brings 60 to hear Duffy and Epps talk about the global task.

Internal: Laiya and Sutiya have new baby girl not yet named.

Contradiction: Catalyzing rapid village involvement in creating visible signs without financial dependence. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANADO—BONTOA HDP**

External: Woman in Ujung Pandang in kind of four sprayers from Agriculture Department for Farmers Co-Op. Five Indonesian companies donate US\$1,250 to sponsor ECF. Health Forum in Bontoa is great success with 75 adults attending and county head of health giving concluding speech, proclaiming, "This is not the same Bontoa as three months ago."

Internal: Five villagers attend ecclesiola and participate fully.

Contradiction: Creating structures to use newly gained workshop skills in planning practical action. (Wk. 5)

## HONG KONG

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Grants of 102,000 pesos are received in one day in the Philippines. Faculty training for Hong Kong Caritas Community Forum is done. Nexus facility proposal for investor to purchase property for ICA is being considered.

Internal: Collegium on China enables struggle with trends.

Contradiction: Getting a willing seller and willing buyer in the same room at the same time. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Dental clinic plumbing and electricity is completed and printer donates printing of advertisements without even being asked. One of the elderly women performs a solo in nationwide singing contest for the elder. One elder and one youth complete two more visa applications to visit the Hai Ou Project.

Internal: The week's focus on summer brooding via constructs covers a host of concerns across the three campaigns.

Contradiction: Covering Project and region responsibly in the summer when many villagers and staff will be away. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Guardian meeting in Taipei discusses Hai Ou's future economic development. Crabs and prawn fry are sold with US\$3,000 profit.

Internal: House celebrates with dinner and a movie in Kaohsiung as quarter planning recreates House structure.

Contradiction: Building models that allow new construction and business expansion to be funded. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Langub HDP economic programs are intensified with visits to engineer of Republic of Philippines AID Barangay Water Program, joint venture negotiations for brick industry, purchase of 50 kilos special mango seeds and securing of electrical system generator, lights and wiring. Head of Republic of Philippines AID mission visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Diane Quinteller, lecturer at graduate school of De La Salle University, is guest at House Church.

Contradiction: Forming of next year's picture that enhances the global Movement. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Taipei metro colleagues contribute money toward India Development request. Taiwan bi-regional meeting of Taipei and Hong Kong Houses sees global film and reveals common grasp of local man's vision and contradictions, enabling first corporate brooding on land-wide imperatives. Taiwan Cement Corporation donates 250 bags of cement to the new facility in Hai Ou.

Internal: House studies Guardians Consult talk *The Life of Service*.

Contradiction: Breaking loose and utilizing new and old Guardian relationships in the economic sector of the government. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Cluster economic fair brings five villages together in Sudtonggan to culminate a month of economic achievement. Two thousand people participate in the day. Winner is chosen by National Youth Representative to National Assembly. In the midst of Economic Fair Project starts planning for May, ending with a Model Village Contest. Insight for month is that you gain a village identity in being over against other villages.

Internal: House celebrates six months of Cluster activity by going to see *The Deer Hunter*.

Contradiction: Finding the one shot that will automatically change the face of the village. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: House sends out 58 participants to the HDTs from the five villages in the Mountain Cluster. The tractor arrives and starts plowing 30 hectares, 2,500 feet of pipe is laid and the water system is turned on bringing regular water to the mountain top for the first time. Davao City sends 20 truckloads of gravel for the Langub road.

Internal: Global Panchayat visits and tours four new Projects in the first vehicle to make it completely across the mountain ridge trail.

Contradiction: Getting everything ready for the four Consults. (Wk. 6)

Internal: Student sojourners begin to lead House meals after a training collegium.

Contradiction: Creating practical images of how to leap from 100 Town Meetings to 1000 Town Meetings. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Village Chief, Kim Bong Joon, and village Saemaul Leader, Koh In Hoon, attend Kuh Du E Ri annual celebration representing the Korean "Senior" Project and present village leaders with a gift. The Lee and Bell families also attend Kuh Du E Ri celebration and remain two days for social regional council.

Internal: Five sojourners care for Lee children and House and accomplish a great ecclesiola study on Bultmann's *Crisis of Faith* in Korean.

Contradiction: Maintaining village movement toward completion while doing the Town Meeting campaign and summer preparations. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Visit with new head of Saemaul Movement (roughly undersecretary for national community development) reveals collegiality and decision to spend three days visiting North American ICA Projects and Chicago Nexus in May.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Regional Council called "The Time of our Lives," a retreat for those who care, combines review of freedom and

church sections of RS-1 with seminary and sodality from first three weeks of ecclesiola and six of the Beatitudes conversations and gets largest turnout all year. Regional planning is accomplished in shortest time ever after Week II of depth contexting and perspective. External: New city council decides to meet twice every month. At first meeting four new ordinances are passed. Leadership in town is excited with new change in city government. Health caretakers meet to continue to expand their role in community.

Internal: Elmer Shell Track visits Job Corps and a nurse spends week in Indianhoma with health caretakers.

Contradiction: Maintaining spirit of change catalyzed by first year celebration and new city council in midst of old ways of doing things. (Wk. 8)

Contradiction: Buring a hole through the fog of struggles while keeping the vehicle running forward. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Northeast Mississippi Town Meetings move along on schedule with four TMs and one CYF. The old tough towns like Byhalia plan for great events this month. LENS appointments are set in Memphis.

Internal: House readies invitations for global film and inkind TM supplies as road troops head for Pace for big planning session.

Contradiction: Preparing with finesse for the film, completed 200 TMs, state assembly, etc. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

Contradiction: Keeping manpower covenants increasing at the same rate that the programs are booked in order to do a thorough job of impact and follow-up on all fronts. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: St. Louis impact contacts lead to clean up in House's neighborhood and several other possibilities throughout city.

Internal: Stating concrete victories during Sunday planning enables lively participation throughout the week.

Contradiction: Breaking loose events in urban impact areas. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

Internal: Response of local core to critical letter in Hibbing newspaper reveals they have seen too much happen to fall for scare tactics.

Contradiction: Breaking free a facility to deal with Voice, industry and child care. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Shirley St. John spends three days in Fifth City working on a public relations strategy for the State of Illinois for the Merry Month of May. The House begins calling campaign to entice colleagues and friends to spend weekends in Lorimor.

Internal: Inking hits a new high after old sources attend the global film and receive invitation to join in Lorimor during the month of May.

Contradiction: Fascinating TWC with all the possibilities of this moment while planning the fall maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Development week nets \$4420 in the pot and another \$3400 working. Mayor Hudnut of Indianapolis sends House a letter asking for an appointment to discuss neighborhood development strategies. Troops for the Merry Month of May move out with Bob Bain and Bill Gookins to Mill Shoals, Anneke Campbell to Indiahoma, and Jackie Specker to Fifth City.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

Contradiction: Operating out of convenience rather than missional need. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

Internal: Bushman family send out to Salani HDP in Western Samoa is occasion for new decisions for many.

External: *The Challenge for Those Who Care of Loisa* continues to turn over forum events. This week the Lillian Wald Houses decide to hold multiple housing forums with local workshop leaders. In Loisa, various housing groups working together is a new phenomenon catalyzed by the *Challenge*.

Internal: A new two-year lease on 49 Claremont Avenue office is secured this week with 475 Riverside Drive.

Contradiction: Swirling multiple foci into one powerful focus which brings House to Quarter II. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Fine RS-I raises possibility of future colleagues.

Internal: House gains the best job in Pittsburgh Printing.

Contradiction: Acting on the promise of the rainbow in the midst of the hailstorm of contingency. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Colleagues' participation in worldwide PSU as part of regular metro meetings generates enthusiasm. New stronghold is opened as Pendleton in Niagra County schedules TM.

Internal: House focuses on catching up on finance reports, and participates in track meets, rehearses for high school play and does inkind blitz.

Contradiction: Building models to focus efforts of last half of quarter. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Momentum in saturating the Hanover tri-micro picks up with intensification of phoning and visitation, particularly Day II, with corporate phone blitzes.

Internal: Week II celebration following a day on the road and House Church held in Ivy City strengthens the regional dynamic.

Internal: House celebration after a successful city-wide 4H CYF claims the promise of a network of CYFs across the state.

Contradiction: Clarifying the missional priority after the Miracle Month of May. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Ten people go to Charlottesville to participate in "Neighbor Labor Days."

Internal: Collegium on the media provides impact on the effect media has on society's images, and of the need to infuse creative images into the media.

Contradiction: Swirling multiple foci into one powerful focus which brings House into Fall. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: The village is full for a special Saturday Town Meeting when around the corner comes the miracle team of Westre and Early in a big yellow truck full of \$10,000 worth of woodworking equipment. Jubilation reigns, as six huge machines are set up in cornshop, women's church group elects to take on cottage industry, and youth group picks 175 pounds of fiddleheads for cash.

Contradiction: Re-establishing regular structures of communications with Starks residents. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Meeting with the executive director of the Governor's Council on Voluntary Action reveals strong support for state funded Town Meetings and a request that the proposal be redrafted, increasing the number of TMs from 65 to 200!

Internal: The House hosts Bob Booher and Jim Troxel for two days, and travels to Starks Week II for the workday.

Contradiction: Weaving a frame of iron support for state funding proposal. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Charlotte Valley Firewood, Ltd. holds first Board of Directors meeting and issues nine shares of stock including first sale outside Project core. #### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

Internal: House celebrates newly formed Mathews family and sends them to assignment in Chicago.

Contradiction: Prioritizing fractured time as auxiliary finds itself assigned in two places at once. (Wk. 7)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: First economically viable model for operating the rabbit project is presented in a collegium by the local manager, and represents a change in policy by the institution backing the rabbit industry. A sub-contract for making curtains is a breakthrough event and is a direct result of contacts made in the GWF. Prospective preschoolers and their mothers participate in a presentation of the program given by the local preschool teachers and view slides on Easter Island courtesy of a Santiago Guardian. Family photos are taken in Sector 1 helping solidify family and sector identity.

Internal: The installation of a Franklin-type stove constructed from an oil drum by a local welder changes frosty mornings into toasty ones and demonstrates a more efficient method of heating local homes.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary deeds without waiting for legalization and surviving the consequences. (Wk. 6)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: Brazil's first ITI begins with five denominations (Roman Catholic, Methodist, Anglican, Presbyterian, Baptist), together with Jews and seven nations (Brazil, Guatemala, Ghana, Singapore, England, Mozambique and the United States) represented. Both statistics are indicative of Brazil's past, present and awesome future in the globe. The state director of Rural Electrification visits Bananeiras with his survey team to begin implementing his model to make Bananeiras a demonstration for his department of delivering service to a community which has a plan for maximum utilization. Parasite medicine arrives and health caretaker guild builds model by stakes for comprehensive care. Four salaries are secured for villagers teaching, gardening, cooking, art and literacy. Voice is printed and distributed.

Internal: Whole House travels to Rio for celebration at Gaucho Restaurant and seeing the film, *Superman*.

Contradiction: Seeing the ITI as key strategy to meeting next year's continental staffing needs. (Wk. 8)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: National Commercial Bank agrees to "being on the hook" for IADB loan, and to help train local loan committee. Development banks \$1,100 Jamaican. Noel and Verlene attend synods of three denominations for ITI recruitment. Tool pool management training is completed.

Internal: Easter discontinuity allows repainting guest room and collegium floor, and all return with resurrected vision.

Contradiction: Launching a quarter that has already begun. (Wk. 5)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Quarter planning council includes representatives from each sector and produces exciting maneuvers chart. Later 600 turn out for slide show of Project by visiting Dan Benedict, who was at Conacaste last year for the Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences new unity through post-planning trip to Lake Amatitlan for overnight discontinuity.

Contradiction: Buying land that is adequate, strategic and cheap. (Wk. 3)

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Seventeen Development calls yield requests for \$12,000 in proposals. Village survey is initiated, Consult brochure sent to the printer, inkind push for the Consult initiated and facility acquired for Lima Metro cadre meetings.

Internal: Access to nearby telephone simplifies Development calling and Saturday barhopping celebration with cadre colleague provides encounter with Peruvian folk music.

Contradiction: Dealing with inadequate practical arrangements in the face of ever-mounting missional demands. (Wk. 6)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that CSA assigns forms to complete grant application and assigns Project monitor. A 102,000 peso grant is picked up in one day in Manila. Forty-one corporation appointments are set in Frankfurt, Brussels and London. The breakthroughs are in the arena of major funding with openings in major businesses, including Germany, Belgium and entrees into the Chinese community in Manila through Chinese Rockefellers. The key contradiction lies in the arena of sustaining necessary funding through the summer.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that First International Ecumenical Conference on the Meaning of Human Suffering creates shocking insights on the state of the Church as it relates to the world today. John Dunne site visit creates occasion for fine Nexus event and dialogue. The ICA annual report moves toward completion, an extraordinary Phase I campsite for summer releases curriculum planning, and significant work on retreat and modules in the field enlightens the edge. Implosions are set off by article, "Revolution in the Village," as collegium data begins to roll in from the globe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the underlying common standpoint of the mission in order to focus the summer effectively.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports four Village Meetings are held around Serusup with outstanding participation from local headmen. Brussels Nexus is represented at Benelux polis coverage, U.K. polis coverage and HDP acceleration. Luncheon at Chicago Nexus for wives of Swiss and German Consul Generals results in film event set for International Women's Club and women of consulate corps, and GWF set for Septemer. GSD post updates Chicago's tracking board and discovers solid economic victories in two-thirds of the HDPs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of raising corporately the deepest questions about the one thrust that will launch us into the future.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Chicago Nexus' participation in the North American Miracle Month of May with the completion of the videotape pilot of Lorimor HDP, the completion of Foray I in transforming the personal storage area, and the Latin American Documentation published. The global band is actualized with the returns of the Majuro trek and the Sydney audit trek. The Hummer family is celebrated and sent-out to their new assignment in Osaka. The Brussels Nexus reports the "Africa Letter" is mailed, a move toward functionalizing all tri-continent systems. Also celebrated is the completion of the 1978 ICA and O:E reports. Breakthroughs and trends are in the arena of Summer preparation which moves well with the inking of 400 gallons of paint, the repair of the ice machine, and other building repairs. In Brussels methods of grants accounting are learned for the future. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting the centrum's mind around period from now to the GRA.
