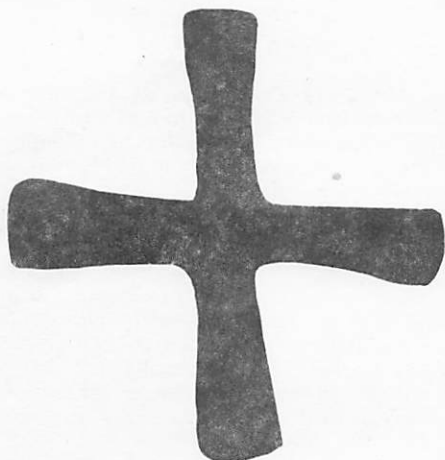


# THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

WEEK FIVE

OCTOBER 29—NOVEMBER 4



## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The first week of metro circuits nets two "set" set, one each in the London and Oxford metros.

Internal: Five Indonesians pay a visit, as well as two new Island families.

Contradiction: Finding a way to celebrate the chaos of overwhelming issues and accelerating external demands. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Glasgow colleagues decide to break loose clergy social service networks for movement events and training. Stuart Hampton participates in Manchester remaneuvering session. Sharon Heiges is sent to the continental Development maneuver in Frankfurt.

Internal: Next door neighbor, Mrs. Hughson, is invited to ecclesiola. Behind the public image of little old Scottish lady is revealed an outstanding criminologist who went to Berkeley, California and Harvard Law School, spent five years in India with the British army, and who speaks fluent French and German.

Contradiction: Winning on all fronts when the propensity and anxiety is to focus all energies on going for broke for just one. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: First Development money is raised and TM presentation is made during trip to Bristol and Plymouth metros.

Internal: Ecclesiola is simplified to enable guests to participate and enables House to push through to depths.

Contradiction: Finding key to breaking loose TM sets and an economic win this quarter when phasing timeline keeps getting pushed to next quarter. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Treks to Birmingham Region give a way to begin serious work.

Internal: House announces the birth of Katherine to Sandra and Keith Robinson.

Contradiction: Keeping to the timeline while honoring regional colleagues. (Wk. 5)

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: First on location contacts and appointments are made.

Internal: Madrid House attends Guardians meeting, visits Paris House and is temporarily housed in low cost pensione in Central Madrid.

Contradiction: Getting wayside hacienda in an overcrowded city. (Wk. 4)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Circuit treks begin second phase of TM set-up. Dates are secured for three meetings in villages around LeChesne and for fund-raising showing of the global film.

Internal: Martin Howell begins as Director of Development at American Hospital of Paris, thus insuring area self-support this year.

Contradiction: Implementing the surprises to sustain the circuit troops. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus hosts Guardians meeting of 50 people followed by area priors meeting.

Internal: Core Guardians convened early to help plan meeting and scheduled a weekend in Quarter III to plan the next meeting.

Contradiction: Creating space designs which enable the hosting of continental events. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: House plans for Area Council. Alice Dwardin visits to catch up on the basic thrusts for the coming year. House participates in Continental Publications Task Force and creates ICA brochure and new image piece.

Internal: House creates a quarter battleplan for the area with keystone maneuvers relating to regular regional circuitry through whole area and movement eventfulness all by doing six regional pilot sets.

Contradiction: Developing structure for consistent Religious House presence while being on the road throughout in the area. (Wk. 1)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP**

External: Four stake meetings prepare challenges for the Assembly. Cooperative women, Isolina DiLoreto and Angelina Raparelli, impact Guardians Meeting and explore markets in Brussels and Paris and celebrate under the Arc de Triomphe.

Internal: In the midst of chaotic troop movements, guest appears for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Discerning the key arenas that will unify the thrust and inform the maneuvers. (Wk. 5)

### **LAGOS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP**

Internal: Demonstration Town Meeting in Mushin (the urban of urban Lagos) is a resounding success with 44 present doing the Town Meeting then reflecting on the method, in preparation for eight Town Meetings in various communities of Mushin on 23rd October.

Internal: House inkind use of TV and generator to watch ceremony of the launching of the Second Republic of Nigeria (transition from military to civilian rule) celebrated on Nigerian Independence Day, October 1.

Contradiction: Building the Development structures in the area, and the Management structures in the village to cope with the monumental projects involved in transition. (Wk. 5)

### **DOUALA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA**

External: French Ministry of Foreign Affairs provides letter of introduction to the French Ambassador to Nigeria.

Internal: Bill is sent out to Nigeria after getting visa in record four-hour time.

Contradiction: Sustaining the momentum of maneuvers initiated while waiting for the next step to occur. (Wk. 5)

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Through walks through Sachsenhausen, the area priors trek and work with the files, House appropriates the turf. By way of a Town Meeting with a womens network in Plettenberg and setting up eight appointments with religious orders House gets on the springboard for the quarter and the year.

Internal: House finally gets not one, but three, washing machines as well as a new used motor into an old car.

Contradiction: Appropriating the victory of being public, effective and recognized through GCF and GSD by daring a four year vision for the area and deciding on the necessary actions now among the many possible ones. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Indonesian celebration with four colleagues from North Sumatra turns into metro formulation event with attendance of Geert Klaussen from International Agricultural Center and opens possibility of new money for North Sumatra.

Internal: New care for the House dynamic becomes visible with donation of magnificent three level chest.

Contradiction: Creating campaign out of diverse interests of colleagues and missional demand. (Wk. 5)

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP**

EXTERNAL: Development and TM trek to Austria results in \$15,000 from Caritas Austria and the Director promising to try and triple the amount, in the near future. In Berlin the TM research is done in anticipation of capitalizing on the Wilmersdorf TM this weekend. Project moves into Christmas Market Task Forces to create another extravaganza this December.

Internal: House's creativity is taxed to the limit as quarter planning and consensus is developed in the midst of Saturday classes, trek preparation and Emerging Generation care.

Contradiction: Implementing structural forms for the new program possibilities is like trying to put up high tension wires after the power has been turned on. (Wk. 5)

### **KINSHASA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP**

External: First LENS of LENS Month begins on the Copperbelt. Anglo-American proposal is submitted. One-half primary school roof is laid in six hours. Visit by officials from the Ministry of Health turns into a happening as they encounter the Village Council spirit of corporateness, two midwives standing to sing them a nutrition song, fine presentation by health care-takers on preventative health care, and interview of village mothers on health practices now being used.

Internal: Auxiliary gives dinner send-out celebration for six men with Natural Resources Development College who end two months living with auxiliary and working in KHDP agriculture.

Contradiction: Keeping the cash flowing which assures full program operation for agriculture planting season and start-up of new economic units. (Wk. 5)

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Consolidation of Egyptian frame is evidenced as Governor signs agreement to permit the beginning of the desert reclamation project and the Agriculture Department accepts responsibility for the remaining details and consultation. A key Egyptian Guardian makes contribution of \$1050 as the beginning of a \$1700 annual pledge.

Internal: Egyptian movement's Emerging Generation is on the rise with the celebration of Gretchen Wegner's sixth birthday and the birth of Heba, daughter of Yusef Shahata and Gamalet.

Contradiction: Using the growing number of movement supporters to forge ahead. (Wk. 5)

### **NAIROBI**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: Kabiro residents join Duke Ellington at the Monterey Jazz Festival as they celebrate at the first Saturday night cinema in the community center. During all week planning sessions, Kabiro residents finish up two year timeline toward completion. Market Committee contributes 44 desks and benches to New Day Nursery School, an event celebrated with D.O., Chief, Sub-chief, villagers and ICA present.

Internal: Madan and Ruby Tribhuwan celebrate their first

- wedding anniversary and rehearse the journey of what it means to be missional family and care for the world.

Contradiction: Willing to stand at the end of Quarter IV and declare the victories over against the multitude of immediate demands. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP**

External: Farmers Guild celebrates the completion of 64 by 35 ft. poultry house as 200 chickens move in. Community workdays with 100 finish Standard Four class room. Handicraft industry production increases as more orders come in.

Internal: House sends out J.R. Barnes on new assignment.

Contradiction: Keeping all fronts covered in midst of total mission demands. (Wk. 4)

### **BOMBAY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: The second Nadlapur consult documentation is completed in English and Telugu and is presented to the Vizar Sultan Tobacco Company (the adopting company). The consult catalyzes breakthroughs in the village which bring new vision for the future to Nadlapur. First reports from Division Strike Forces proclaim positive response in villages to DOOP (do your own project) modules being held in all 232 villages.

Internal: Nexus hosts Bombay Division Strike Force in between modules and gets first hand reports on module effectiveness.

Contradiction: Holding tension between local and global additional emphasis on centrum and areal priorities. (Wk. 4)

### **DELHI**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: Ten buffalo loans are sanctioned by the Bank of India. One more street is bricked with 10,000 new bricks being sanctioned. Fortnightly family planning clinic is set up.

Internal: House does pre-Council planning for the year towards the awakenment of 1,500,000 settlements.

Contradiction: Creating inclusive design that uses troops and time to win on all fronts. (Wk. 12)

### **MADRAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Villagers start building a 150 feet stone and cement drain with voluntary labor.

Internal: Auxiliary spends the morning cleaning the house and caps the day with dinner and movie at Sangareddy.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to make visits to government departments in spite of heavy farm work. (Wk. 11)

### **CALCUTTA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: House prepares for the first circuit of the year in Area Calcutta to Patna region.

Internal: Parish walk through Park Circus on Saturday night turns into a celebrative event.

Contradiction: Breaking loose imagination to expand and get access to resources that will enable this quarter's awakenment campaign to come off. (Wk. 5)

### **SINGAPORE**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Everyone dispersing to area councils enables immediate grounding on the turf.

Internal: Decision to win on all fronts including Singapore registration necessitates temporary relocation to Kuala Lumpur.

Contradiction: Empowering programmatic momentum in the midst of the intrusion of relocation practices. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Malaysian Airline Systems agrees to ship handicraft bags to London, enroute to Paris, free of charge for U.N. show. Courtesy visits to two ministers reveal great interest and possibility of strong support in coming year. One year report that documents accomplishments of Project impacts all including the auxiliary.

Internal: Site is sent out to Bubun Training School staff from Singapore, Zabarah is sent out from Serusup to family in Sungai Lui and Elvie Languido arrives from the Philippines to be part of Serusup auxiliary.

Contradiction: Assuring the highest authorization possible in order to plow into impact campaign and expansion to Cluster villages. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP**

External: Visit with Nor Ghanie, the Director General of Social-Economic Research for Malaysia, generates much enthusiasm and strategies for framing Malaysia for TM. Villagers continue to move with Stakes I and V painting their mosques and Agriculture and Education Guilds meeting to determine future.

Internal: Rochmat finally arrives and brings along Neil Rees to help plan the quarter as Siti is sent out to Bubun HDTs.

Contradiction: Focusing the many activities in the village into one common thrust. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Development visits to Natrabu, IBM local affiliate, and PTPXI produces program and income for the future. Asam and Nurdin buy goats as a result of DOOP.

Internal: Due halfprice obtained for two preschoolers six days a week.

Contradiction: Orchestrating yeses from public sector, private sector, and villages to implement future models. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: The community, in a whirlwind of implementation, completes its preparations for the governor's visit. To the surprise of all, he arrives early and is halfway to the village center before anyone realizes who he is. The unconventional visit continues as he stops and talks to villagers, enters shops and homes, views demonstration gardens and later, after the speeches, discusses his vision of the village as an inclusive cooperative entity in the presence of a small group of government officials, villagers and staff.

Internal: It is a week of comings and goings as troops are continually shifted and the undergirding of the Great North Sumatra Breakthrough begins.

Contradiction: Maintaining the total village implementation drive catalyzed by the governor's coming now that the event is over. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP**

External: First anniversary preparation swings into high gear with village committee collecting eggs and cash to cover snack expenses. Workdays continue on mosque renovation. Fish pond guild member calls on cold storage company to explore a cooperative shrimp export venture.

Internal: New decor sparkles in collegium room and Ann Epps arrives to assist on first annual report documentation.

Contradiction: Readjusting the DOOP methods quickly to assure continuity between deciding and acting. (Wk. 4)

## HONG KONG

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Participating in the HDTs launch in Sudtonggan and helping replace plantings lost in the typhoon in Nam Wai gives House the opportunity to be of service on site in two Projects.

Internal: A super special ice cream cake marked celebration of Patricia Tuecke's 44th birthday.

Contradiction: Forming methods to discern continental consensus. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: First youth meeting of year decides to continue *Nam Wai Voice* and plans lantern completion for moon festival which is a celebrative highlight in the village. All five stakes hold meetings to elect members to board. Four stakes vote in representatives from Phase II, retaining two incumbents.

Internal: House welcomes Danny and David Chu as sojourners in the house.

Contradiction: Seeing beyond the immediate possibilities to the long range necessities. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Key Guardian decides to host movement building event in Kaohsiung hotel. Village demonstrates its readiness to move with a community-wide workday to deepen a flood control ditch.

Internal: House sends out Steve Townley to teach in Sudtonggan HDTs and is hosted to tremendous feast by a local politician who asks about Korea and other Projects.

Contradiction: Building momentum in the village while having to be in Kaohsiung on inkind and self-support call. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Completion of two week Development trek reveals new major companies willing to support Human Development as 66 visits produce 36 proposals totalling P660,000.

Internal: Internal life experiences area reports and stories as area troops converge on Manila House.

Contradiction: Finding the steps to push through existing programs which release imagination to encounter new approaches to same thrust. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: First Development week of 79-80 yields \$3000 deposited (\$2000 from in-house LENS), and \$20,000 in proposals submitted. Two more LENS courses are requested by Kaohsiung Monomer Corporation and Control Data Far East, Inc.

Internal: Forty inquiries phone in for ICA staff position after one-day newspaper ad.

Contradiction: Doing Quarter II in the context of adequately anticipating the demands and maneuvers of Quarters III and IV. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Four day miraculous inkind blitz for HDTs nets P72,650 committed and working, enabled by government agency support systems through daily delivery of five teams to Cebu by government jeep and use of government office as logistics center. Hit and run recruitment team 'calls the roll up yonder' in Cebu Mountains and Mactan Island and returns with 38 registered HDTs participants and 27 working.

Internal: Moonrise celebration on new HDTs building veranda followed by sunrise workday for HDTs ground preparation launches final week of HDTs preparation.

Contradiction: Crystallizing into one master convergent image for the year the many thrusts of HDTs and Projects expansion preparation. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Singer donates another sewing machine to Project enabling sewing industry expansion. Source of cacao seeds is located that is adequate to supply needs for whole year with first batch of 20,000 promised in November.

Internal: House sends Yodofredo Estonyio to Cebu HDTs staff.

Contradiction: Setting the stage for massive participation in all five Projects. (Wk. 5)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Town Meeting in Uenohara opens the door to stronghold set-up in Yamanashi Prefecture. Phone call from a high government official in Shizuoka Prefecture signals the initiation of the fourth of four strongholds for this year. Seibu TM project intensifies as the company requests two TM per day, instead of one, in order to complete the full 50 by the end of February.

Internal: Hong Kong Development team arrives, followed closely by typhoon number 20 which roars through Tokyo.

Contradiction: Collecting enough volunteers with enough available time to allow the great leap to result in a solid advance rather than a crash landing. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG II HDP**

External: Visit to Provincial Governor and Saemaul Chief strengthens public sector frame.

Internal: The Lee family completes two and one half years of work in Kwang Yung II with great celebrations and an award from the government as they head for new assignment.

Contradiction: Finding the indirection to allow consensus of many colleagues to emerge clearly. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Recent Academy grads meet and offer help in any arena needed. Lutheran mission group invites House to submit a village funding proposal.

Internal: House creates space in its five rooms for 12 to sleep as it hosts new Jeju staff and the Bergdalls.

Contradiction: Determining the level of chaos that justifies a fresh ordering of the summers imagination. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Assistant Governor approves purchase of village pigs at a good price in the midst of a very depressed hog market. A medical team from the National Ministry of Medical and Social Affairs visits the Project after a local Saemaul leader

gave a testimonial at a national Saemaul (New Community) leaders meeting.

Internal: The Project car gives out resulting in daily 45 minute walks across the mountains for permeator Phyllis and student Park Chi Hueon.

Contradiction: Providing good staff and methods for Provincial Government Training Institute in midst of other demands. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Okinawa trek to build stronghold network continues through week three. Twenty-fifth anniversary celebration of Shiroyama church in Nagasaki includes album featuring TM story.

Internal: Entire House attends celebration of National Sports Day with Fukuoka nursery schools.

Contradiction: Weaving Development story into stronghold maneuver. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Chubu circuit schedules a Town Meeting in an ungolded prefecture as volunteer Kyoko Kadoya goes on her first circuit. Announcement of scheduled RS-I gets a bigger response than anticipated. Friday evening at the Institute attendance continues to grow as Quarter II ecclesiola construct impacts Japanese young adults.

Internal: House fills up as Mali KBAlm family arrives from India, Area Director Don Clark visits and Haruko Ojima begins her sojourn stay.

Contradiction: Creating the models that release the power at the staff and volunteers so that at every moment all sense the fulfillment of participation in Human Development. (Week 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: Oyubari Youth Group TM creates recreation and beautification proposals and plan for international interchange. Industrial research continues with local Guardians. Evening at the Institute is held at Neighborhood Leaders Meeting in Yubari.

Internal: House attends three hour Japanese Cultural Talent Show with polished performances ranging from traditional Japanese music and dancing to disco and ballet.

Contradiction: Building enough personal contacts to allow for enough decisions to be made so that meetings can be held which profoundly move the Project ahead. (Wk. 5)

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Screening of the inkind donor cards reveals willingness to make marketing expertise available to Murrin Bridge for industry intensification. Area taskforce puts together report of first trek and mails to Houses.

Internal: Barbara Brown secures first job applied for after nursing registration is approved.

Contradiction: Having a clear enough consensus on each direction to be able to move with power. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Visit with Anglican Bishop reveals his inquisitiveness on the movement's shift in the 12 years since his 10 day RS-I in 1967. Facility search puts House in touch with new networks and people. RS-I brochure is mocked up.

Internal: House is pleased to hear of Bob Hawley's arrival in Sydney.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between self-support and program when there is so much to do. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: State M.P. agrees to use of his name for Lower Murray Saturation Cluster. High school senior master asks, "How many days would you like?" for school CYF.

Internal: Rev. Ken Maher sojourns while attending State Church Synod and brings car full of food to add to great week of inkind.

Contradiction: Clarifying the means to move from initiating skirmishes to the center of the battle. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Victoria State frame begins to take shape with Eric Kent and Bob Luxford assisting House to set appointment with MLC from Pakenham, Roy Ward. Sir Roger Darvall sends his own letter of invitation to 100 key business contacts in Melbourne to view Murrin Bridge Trade Fair. Potter Foundation says yes to grant for \$10,000 over next two years.

Internal: Mailing to 72 colleagues and Pakenham saturation plan is enabled by area task force of Barry Oakley and Jay Antenen.

Contradiction: Creating a story and plan to raise up and journey colleagues in the mission. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: New commercial zucchini patch is planted by team of men and irrigation system is set up. First Busty Betty dressmakers model is made for contract. Marketing team returns with cash in hand and order to fill.

Internal: Study of Nyerere's paper at ecclesiola is powerful event in presence of Anglican priest and wife.

Contradiction: Spelling out a practical vision for Aboriginal people beyond their own community. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: First regional CYF is set up for November II. Quarter maneuver paragraphs are written. National brochure map with dots for all CMAs is finished.

Internal: Income projections enable visioning for future.

Contradiction: Solidifying authorization and support out of immediate possibilities and in spite of limited time. (Wk. 5)

### **SUVA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: House experiences a week of launchings with Economic Community Forum presentation, first wave of Development proposals submitted for Town Meeting: Hawaii, Samoa ITI recruitment strategy created with metro colleagues, and the grand opening of the new government office building.

Internal: TASC's old coconut wood office gets its first coat of paint and looks great.

Contradiction: Taking full advantage of preoccupation of government with May 1, 1980 celebration of Marshalls constitution to transparentize MHDP and TASC's new role. (Week 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

Contradiction: Creating the structure for the new quarter's tactics. (Wk 4)

**RIO DE JANEIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: Scoreboard at the futebol field goes up. Community volunteers are procured for the after school program. The municipal Prefect is visited to report on the HDP and receives favorable report from him on the HDP. The Actor (second largest land owner in Bananeiras) requests a trash barrel and his wife signs up for English classes

Internal: Jim and Karen come back from Sao Paulo trek with two GWFs set up.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers who consense on the need for programs to pour their life's blood into them. (Wk. 5)

**HAVANA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Kingston Development starts week with full schedule of appointments. Week II wedding of leading community family sparks a week of renewed engagement, preschool workday and spirited stake meetings.

Internal: House members celebrate two birthdays with song fest night before and fast on the birthday

Contradiction: Balancing the tension between careful planning and coordination and immediate signs. (Wk 3)

**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: Luncheon, hosted by President Lucas provides occasion of learning about favorable reports. Development push is accelerated with help of Inga Besin, enroute to Chicago. Well-drilling machine is made available for water drilling and permission granted for crossing land with irrigation pipe through collaboration of the Governor of department.

Internal: Schlesinger family arrives after a three week trek through Mexico.

Contradiction: Moving on the water well-drilling while Development demands are increasing. (Wk. 5)

**LIMA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP**

External: New life is injected into the Agricultural Guild with the visit of the National Agrarian University to set up the small animal farm with ducks, meat producing guinea pigs and rabbits.

Internal: Completed period of discontinuity brings House back as a whole, refreshed and ready for new challenges.

Contradiction: Creating the self-consciousness of the long march of the project while maintaining timeline of tactics. (Wk. 13)

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

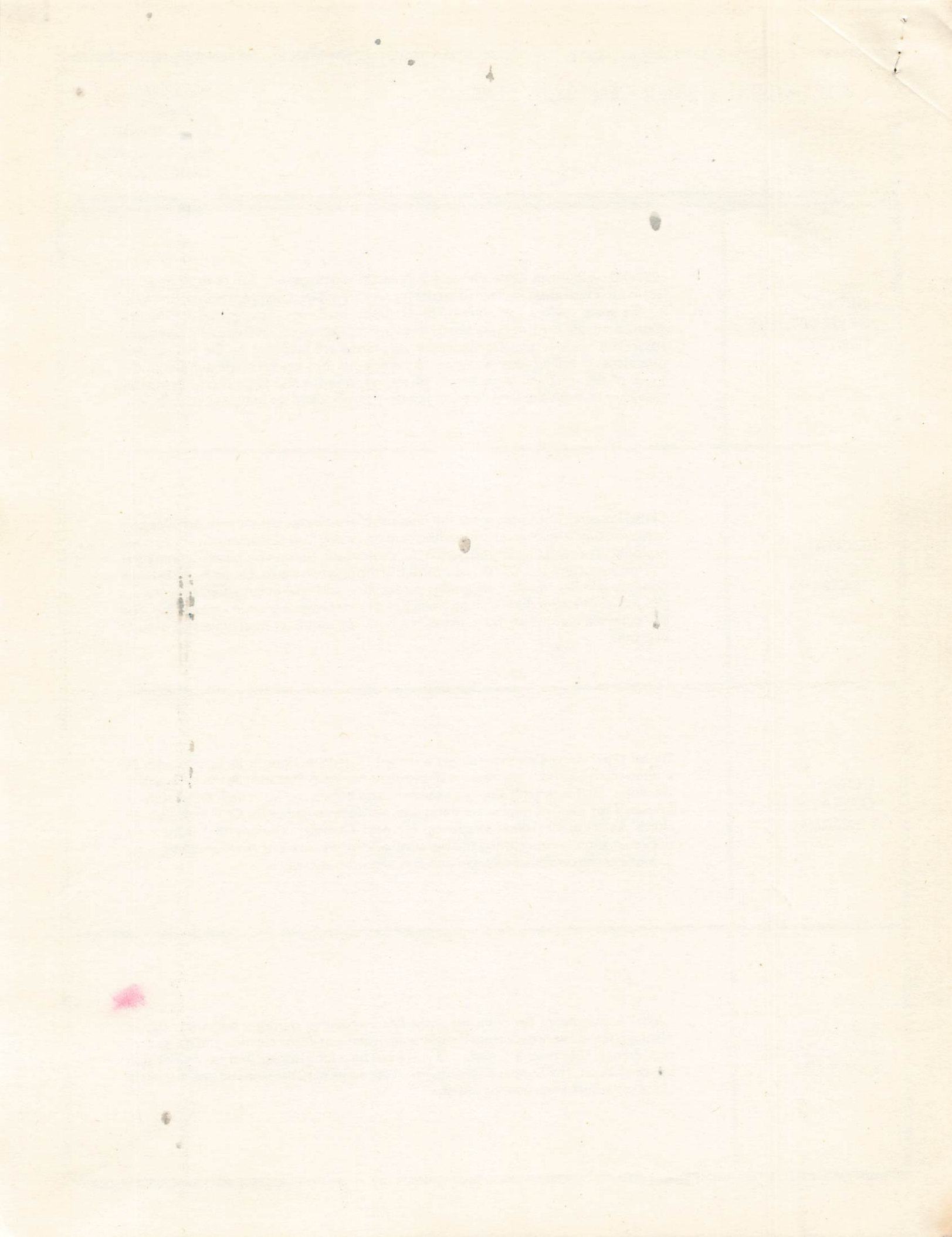

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

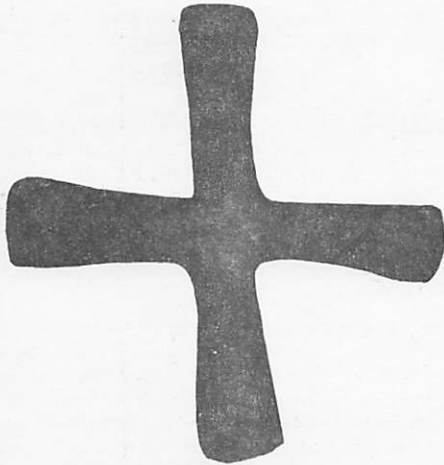

Internal: Egyptian movement's Emerging Generation is on the rise with the celebration of Gretchen Wegner's sixth birthday and the birth of Heba, daughter of Yusef Shahata and Gamalet.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop reassignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

## BOMBAY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

Women and men of village are hosted in Kuala Pilah by the Handicraft Center to discuss the village's participation in producing handicraft products as an economic venture.

Internal: Elenor Lovet visits Sungai Lui occasioning a House celebration with Australian beer and the next night at the Hilton to check out the show as a permeation probe.

Contradiction: Finding a structural way to deal with the long standing divisions within the Kampong. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: House receives breakthroughs on three fronts including government, private sector, and village support. Kampung Dahun decides to buy goats as the first activity for six months.

Internal: House sends out Fon, Katherine Barton, Tim Casswell, and Achmad to Bubun.

Contradiction: Getting formal village leaders to push actuation without auxiliary staff leading the charge. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: A woman is elected chairman of village Youth Guild. Youth Guild decides on weekly meetings with songs and rituals. Village elects Phase II person as member at large on Village Foundation Board and retains Yau Kuen Lin as chairman.

Contradiction: Riding the crest with the next trough undiscerned. (Wk. 6)

Contradiction: Finding the steps to push through existing programs which release imagination to encounter new approaches to same thrust. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: First Development week of 79-80 yields \$3000 deposited (\$2000 from in-house LENS), and \$20,000 in proposals submitted. Two more LENS courses are requested by Kaohsiung Monomer Corporation and Control Data Far East, Inc.

Internal: Forty inquiries phone in for ICA staff position after one-day newspaper ad.

Contradiction: Doing Quarter II in the context of adequately anticipating the demands and maneuvers of Quarters III and IV. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

Participants will graduate ready to launch into maneuvers. Carpenters blow whistle on last lap toward completion of HDTS building number three by working all night by the light of a kerosene lamp.

Internal: House receives Mali Balm, Steve Townley, and Eleuterio Mahusay as HDTS faculty. New generator arrives to HDTS assuring early morning faculty meetings with light.

Contradiction: Focusing corporate energies on the specific tasks necessary to do monthly maneuver in order to be ready for 24 consults in six weeks. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Village assemblies held in Carmen HDP, Magtuod HDP, LaPaz HDP, Valencia HDP and Langub HDP produce new excitement over two new programs, the cacao expansion and sewing expansion. Valencia HDP reports new road is bulldozed to Luman, artisan well completed and petition for electricity started, all on their own. City Health starts two month weekly mothers class in Langub HDP.

Internal: House garden expands to two new plots.

Contradiction: Getting everything ready for 20,000 cacao seedlings in one week. (Wk. 6)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Thirty-five attend a powerful National Guardians Meeting at the Mitsui Shipbuilding Company headquarters. AFIA Insurance Company signs on as a Town Meeting sponsor and presents check for the first half of a one million yen contribution.

Internal: Weekly Japanese language collegium is exciting and practical with Eija Karikowski as the teacher.

Contradiction: Getting strong images of the nature of the future relationships with companies and prefectures in order to design the necessary next steps. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG II HDP**

External: Visit to Provincial Governor and Saemaul Chief strengthens public sector frame.

Internal: The Lee family completes two and one half years of work in Kwang Yung II with great celebrations and an award from the government as they head for new assignment.

Contradiction: Finding the indirection to allow consensus of many colleagues to emerge clearly. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: House conducts refresher workshop training for elite Ewha Girls School faculty, lines up purchase of 10 dairy calves from demonstration farm to initiate project herd, and receives offer of 50 medical students for health clinic module boost in villages surrounding project.

Internal: All are deeply impressed by poise and calm of citizens in Seoul amidst sudden death of President Park.

Contradiction: Finding the ways and the means to allow self-support to enable rather than overwhelm the external task. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Assistant Governor approves purchase of village pigs at a good price in the midst of a very depressed hog market. A medical team from the National Ministry of Medical and Social Affairs visits the Project after a local Saemaul leader gave a testimonial at a national Saemaul (New Community) leaders meeting.

Internal: The Project car gives out resulting in daily 45 minute walks across the mountains for permeator Phyllis and student Park Chi Hueon.

Contradiction: Providing good staff and methods for Provincial Government Training Institute in midst of other demands. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Three showings of global film includes Yamaguchi Jesuit priests and group of distinguished physicians. Sunday House celebration and global film nets new volunteers.

Internal: Permeation projection is met for October.

Contradiction: Building and weaving winning tactics to complete the regional golding into stronghold maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: GWF leadership core meets for first time since last winter and offers their time for Town Meeting circuits and translation work as well as GWF leadership roles. Roger Marsh and Ko Yokohama are sent out to National Advisors' Meeting in Tokyo and uncover Japanese speaking pedagogues for LENS and RS-I.

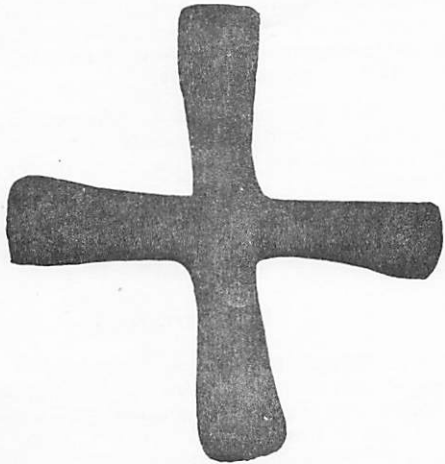

External: Development and Operations are dispersed to six locations during the week.

Internal: House has a week of powerful collegiums and a fine ecclesiola atmosphere.

Contradiction: Having a structure of cross-centrum Nexus task assignment which empowers the Nexus but doesn't debilitate the Centrum. (Wk.)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

Christmas Market is the occasion for a swirl of Development among the local auxiliary, resulting in over 6000 DM committed already.

Internal: Installation of central heating turns house into construction zone and reconstruction task force transforms office, collegium, and lounge space into model of human living environment.

Contradiction: Extending the structural relationship of the House and project to the next level of project and community. (Wk.7)

**KINSHASA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPININ HDP**

External: Fourth LENS Seminar is a fine one with 19 Shell and B.P. Zambia Ltd. middle management men. Village Forum Teams I and II (two auxiliary and two villagers) return reporting 21 forums in 15 days, and carrying a fine letter of appreciation from Eastern Province official. Village Forum Teams III and IV are sent out to North-West Province.

Internal: Spaghetti dinner is prepared and served by LENS team members Ray Caruso and Jack Gilles

Contradiction: Organizing all tasks in order to release corporate power. (Wk.6)

**CAIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Consolidation of Egyptian frame is evidenced as Governor signs agreement to permit the beginning of the desert reclamation project and the Agriculture Department accepts responsibility for the remaining details and consultation. A key Egyptian Guardian makes contribution of \$1050 as the beginning of a \$1700 annual pledge.

Internal: Egyptian movement's Emerging Generation is one the rise with the celebration of Gretchen Wegner's sixth birthday and the birth of Heba, daughter of Yusef Shahata and Gamalet.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

## BOMBAY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Fine celebration with Chinese and Indian dishes and fireworks marks Diwali (goddess of wealth) and begins major agency Development push.

Contradiction: Creating solid maneuvers to complete the year's work by December for first year celebration in Sikror. (Wk. 7)

## MADRAS

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Villagers start building a 150 feet stone and cement drain with voluntary labor.

Internal: Auxiliary spends the morning cleaning the house and caps the day with dinner and movie at Sangareddy.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to make visits to government departments in spite of heavy farm work. (Wk. 11)

## CALCUTTA

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Twelve impact events are scheduled in the set-up phase of campaign.

Internal: House hosts Guardian couple and Canadian visitors (Bill Staples' mom and friend) for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating a practical strategy that allows House to break loose impact in Regions Calcutta and Asansol. (Wk. 7)

## SINGAPORE

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: House raises over 45,000 USD during last two weeks with 33,000 raised in Week 5.

Internal: House welcomes the Pauls enroute to Medan.

Contradiction: Getting the move over so House can move on. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Malaysian Airline Systems agrees to ship handcraft bags to London, enroute to Paris, free of charge for U.N. show. Courtesy visits to two ministers reveal great interest and possibility of strong support in coming year. One year report that documents accomplishments of Project impacts all including the auxiliary.

Internal: Site is sent out to Bubun Training School staff from Singapore, Zabarah is sent out from Serusup to family in Sungai Lui and Elvie Languido arrives from the Philippines to be part of Serusup auxiliary.

Contradiction: Assuring the highest authorization possible in order to plow into impact campaign and expansion to Cluster villages. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP**

External: Research is done on market for bamboo and rotan. Development/authorization push for comprehensive framing includes creating brochure to be used with government officials for expansion authorization in the midst of developing bread and butter money.

Internal: Staff house guest room and front fence are beautified.

Contradiction: Finding jobs that will assist in the development of the nation as well as serve as self-support. (Wk. 7)

Internal: Two new job possibilities for permeator.

Contradiction: Creating a formal development unit between village leadership, district government and ICA. (Wk. 7)

Internal: A super special ice cream cake marked celebration of Patricia Tuecke's 44th birthday.

Contradiction: Forming methods to discern continental consensus. (Wk.5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: A woman is elected chairman of village Youth Guild. Youth Guild decides on weekly meetings with songs and rituals. Village elects Phase II person as member at large on Village Foundation Board and retains Yau Kuen Lin as chairman.

Internal: House celebrates arrival of newest member, Catherine Lai Lai Shing, born October 18th.

Contradiction: Riding the crest with the next trough undiscerned. (Wk.6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Momentum gathers on building of Hai Ou Community Center as steel and cement work are completed for ceiling, labor is on site for next stage of work, and Ping Tung government provides transport for remainder of inkind steel. Self-support maneuver culminates in breakthrough of office and English teaching jobs. Invitations for fund-raising Guardian Dinner are sent out.

Internal: Week begins with staff participation at traditional Chinese wedding in the village.

Contradiction: Assuring cash flow for building completion as local momentum accelerates. (Wk.6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Toyota-Delta Motors is shipping in-kind contribution of a jeepney-pickup for use in Mactan projects. USAID urges the submission of a proposal now in the range of \$150,000 with AID considering up to sixty percent for 24 projects. Visits with Region VI Baex Director Aquino and staff of the Kabsaka program prepare for talks to include ICA community component in a regional infrastructure project co-sponsored by the World Bank and the Philippine government.

Contradiction: Handling the comprehensive while being flooded with the immediate. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Introducing House, as new staff, to old contacts finds refreshing reminders of how RS-1 has changed lives and how TM contacts are hungry for the spirit dynamics which we know.

Internal: RS-1 study reminds House that is the way life is.

Contradiction: Focusing House energies. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Twenty teams re-contact over 160 communities that have had TMs during the Salute to Ohio and Indiana Maneuver and discover that local resurgence is for real.

Internal: The printing press comes to life just in time to print materials for Salute to Ohio.

Contradiction: Keeping ahead of the race as many batons are passed at once. (Wk.6)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Eighteen people from region attend Starks Corn Shop grand opening. Brooklyn metro meeting begins to develop core leadership. Development circuit in Paterson involves many metro troops.

Internal: House prepares for 41 for LENS pedagogy along with full hostelry.

Contradiction: Scheduling events that occasion depth decision to raise up core leadership in metros. (Wk.6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Vol. 2, No. 1 of *Community Network* newsletter is in the mail to 1400 with enough photo ready articles left over to fill half of No. 2.

Internal: First baths in new house following week 1 move.

Contradiction: Honoring external demands without letting local plans go down the drain. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: House returns from LENS pedagogy session in New York. Final draft and pasteups for the newsletter are finished. The Binghamton probe maneuver gets accelerated with a fine contradictory analysis training session with local participants.

Internal: Two House youth are honored in the math league at school and are on TV and the school holds an open house which gives a key insight into today's educational malaise.

Contradiction: Creating the story which allows the promise of CYFs to bear fruit and come alive. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Ball bounces to other end of court as colleagues continue to introduce ICA to Richmond by getting out 200 GWF invitations, holding businessman's luncheon with film show downtown, and holding an international evening in colleague's home.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP**

External: Halloween Carnival makes profit due to many donations of goods. Attendance at the Carnival doubles last year's.

Internal: Interview for County Rural Planning job excites possibilities for self-support and county framing at the same time.

Contradiction: Monitoring consensus among community men in order to catalyze upcoming events. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Appointment with an agency representative in South Philadelphia surprises House with unexpected support as he reveals a variety of network targets and leaders for the next moves in South Philadelphia.

Internal: Informal workshop on guardians clarifies the role of guardians and illuminates the next steps in building a guardian network.

Contradiction: Utilizing network contacts to schedule a series of demonstration events as another step toward the state campaign. (Wk.6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: World's Largest Ribbon Cutting (60 inches long and 3 inches wide) launches the celebration of the Grand Opening of the Cornshop with over 100 people present who listen to talks by County, State and Governor's office representatives praising the efforts here in community and economic development. Festivities centered around Apple the Clown, The Little Peeps Marching Band, and entertainer Jud Strunk. Local High School Homecoming Game is won 28-0 against League leader with perfect record and over 100 people gathered back in the evening at the Cornshop for a Halloween Potluck Supper and Contra Pane sponsored by the peep parents.

Internal: Huge, gigantic House Church is celebrated with Loisaida, Lorne De L'acadie, Hartford, Boston, and New York represented.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on new momentum to guarantee Starks Invincible and State campaign. (Wk.6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: South Stratford core launch, Hartford global film event, support troops for Starks, and major Development/authorization appointments offer strong sense of movement momentum.

Internal: Abundance of local and visiting troops dramatizes intensity of facility limitations and leads to rejoicing at finding new facility.

Contradiction: Conditions on yes in present State Campaign channel raises question of effectivity of that vehicle, demanding strategic alternatives. (Wk.5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Participation in LENS pedagogy in New York House heightens consciousness of the power of the methods and sharpens the how-to.

Contradiction: Discerning and impacting the community structures which will create a revolutionary group that will care for the community into the 80's. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Ottawa sends representatives to the Canadian ICA Board of Directors meeting in Montreal. OHDP takes 10 leaps forward as House mingles with reeves and mayors across Ontario at the Association of Counties and Regions in Ontario (ACRO).

Internal: Halloween kicks off week of celebrative activities including Priger's birthday party and a fine ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Deciding which lily pad to land on when being pushed off the cliff of decisions on the Ontario HDP. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Team in Halifax does Global Development. First Lorne firetruck returns to town repaired. Government grant agency visits Lorne Economic Development Corporation.

Internal: As cold weather approaches, auxiliary house is winterized and all see *Rocky II* movie for celebration.

Contradiction: Deciding the approach to regional and project strategy which holds tensions. (Wk. 7)

**CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Expanding village regrid itself from three to seven sectors with rotating weekly celebrations. Volunteer couple leaves for a week of exploring Colombia.

Internal: Jungle Jam wins in Caracas, and prompts new wild experiment.

Contradiction: Keeping Foro Campaign in focus as priority while relocating Caracas office. (Wk.7)

**BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Week of firsts opens many new possibilities with first sales of strawberries from demonstration farm, first week of sewing class, preschool expanding to morning session for youngest children, and first offer of sub-contract industry with 3M packaging of *Scotch-Brite* cleaning pads.

Internal: Joaquina Rodriguez of auxiliary passes final exams and completes her formal education.

Contradiction: Working through legal status blocks in marketing stymies House in many fronts including agriculture, commerce and public land issue. (Wk.7)

**RIO DE JANEIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: After school program skyrockets in popularity, with attendance doubling from the previous week. Women in the community meet for the first bakery guild meeting and decide to organize themselves in shifts and take payment in bread to get the bakery on its feet and moving. Phase II of the home garden program is marked by Ruth's delivering the results of the agricultural survey to all participating families and returning laden with the fruits of the labor including couve, lettuce and chicory for corporate consumption.

Internal: Day of the Dead is marked by white washing the cemetery with villagers.

Contradiction: Journeying bakery women to the next step of responsibility. (Wk.7)

**HAVANA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Week II strike force meeting in Portland Parish results in set up of four TMs and one assembly during week Six. Special Saturday workday on Preschool building moves roof to one-step before completion. Kingston cadre shows global film as part of community meeting in central area of the city.

Internal: House celebrates National Heroes Day with village, enjoying chicken, "rough water" (overproof rum) and dancing at the local discos.

Contradiction: Figuring out how to use the Industry Day event to focus completion of the first month of the quarter. (Wk.7)

**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: First harvest of green peas is ready to go to market. Saturday workday recreates plaza space after month of festivities there. First \$500 is picked up from Development push.

Internal: Ruth Marshall's birthday is celebrated with good Guatemalan rum.

**Contradiction:** Ensuring powerful GWFs and great Development trek week while other demands threaten to consume House. (Wk.7)

## **LIMA**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VINCENTE DE AZPITIA HDP**

**External:** New life is injected into the Agricultural Guild with the visit of the National Agrarian University to set up the small animal farm with ducks, meat producing guinea pigs and rabbits.

**Internal:** Completed period of discontinuity brings House back as a whole, refreshed and ready for new challenges.

**Contradiction:** Creating the self-consciousness of the long march of the project while maintaining timeline of tactics. (Wk.6)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum circuit week in North America brings 94 cheques in hand. Indonesia Governer OKs US\$75,000 private sector contributors for HDTs. US \$30,000 are promised in private funds in North Sumatra. Clusters of forums break open crucial part of Development pitch. The key contradiction lies in the arena of implementing models which replicate victories with fewer troops and shorter timespan.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports HDTIs one with 68 just ended in Maliwada as another begins in Bubun. Eventfulness in Maliwada is the numbers taking assignment of any village and GWF that released participation of nine women. Area Bombay sends out Internal Life Guide and prepares for six week Global Methods School for more experienced project directors and auxiliary. Singapore reports experimentation with launching clusters within the HDTs construct. In Bombay nine people are sent to Maliwada for training by the National Small Industries Corporations a central government agency. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating motivational methods for implementing models already on the ground like HDPs and HDTs as well as forging new implementing arenas such as urban probes.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports a Global Guardians Consult in Europe with 54 around the table. Nam Wai reviews 26 tactics in a strategy PSU and see that nine tactics are done. HDTs in Fifth City, Kawangware and Bubun are launched. Operations is prepared for the future with six states and provinces targeted for GCF campaigns in North America, Guardians preparing for next Guardian Consult in Europe, and documentation in Hong Kong. The key contradiction lies in the arena of enabling areas to move on discerned advantages and consensed on strategies.

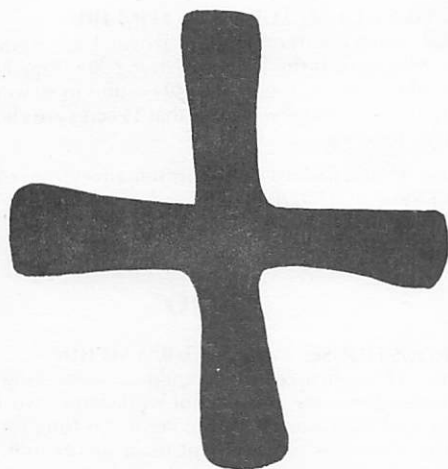
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum Chicago reports systems are fixed to allow best in the Nexus. The kitchen is blessed with two inkinded food processors. The printing of ITI materials and the grassroots Christmas mailing reaches the half way mark. October ICA books are closed. Singapore reports that USAID report moves way down the road and Bubun AID report is submitted. Hong Kong Nexus reports ICA program checks released on time. The trend is creating the structures, budgets which allow for a more creative response to the economic. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creatively responding to the demands of the time while still doing the mission.

Internal: House budget rapidly improves with new job and other incomes.

Contradiction: Pushing the self-support victory to all the other arenas. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Capital funds Development drive puts auxiliary in contact with business community in South Wales and breaks loose possibility of church funding.

Internal: Bob Rank leads collegium on the state of the Church in Europe.

Contradiction: Finding cash and maximizing in-kind sources to achieve the completion of the community building. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Appointments and visits with women and youth groups result with first two calls netting two CYFs.

Internal: First self-support cheques are sent in.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between breaking open a network and doing a delimited geographical area in depth. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Deciding which of the first priorities (on road, jobs, housing, visits and materials translation) is first. (Wk. 9)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum set-up meeting for four Chartreuse towns solidifies commitment of colleagues, sets training and forum date, and convinces a mayor to visit El Bayad HDP in December.

Internal: Both House cars are junked: one from old age and the other from an encounter with a mountain.

Contradiction: Accelerating logistics to the point where they enable, rather than block, the task. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Development and Operations are dispersed to six locations during the week.

Internal: House has a week of powerful collegiums and a fine ecclesiola atmosphere.

Contradiction: Having a structure of cross-centrum Nexus task assignment which empowers the Nexus but doesn't debilitate the Centrum. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Urban set in Gent guest worker neighborhood starts with big local set-up meeting.

Internal: Open House catalyzes new House decor.

Contradiction: Discerning way to link Gent set to regional formulation. (Wk. 6)

## ROME

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: House sends out TM circuiters in midst of intensive push on marketing and capitalization for the wood industry.

Internal: House welcomes John Stringham, Paula Philbrook, and sojourner, Pat Doyle, for PSU on the wood industry.

Contradiction: Learning how to market products while teaching the Cooperative to market products. (Wk. 9)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Demonstration Town Meeting in Mushin (the urban of urban Lagos) is a resounding success with 44 present doing the Town Meeting then reflecting on the method, in preparation for eight Town Meetings in various communities of Mushin on 23rd October.

Internal: House in-kinds use of TV and generator to watch ceremony of the launching of the Second Republic of Nigeria (transition from military to civilian rule) celebrated on Nigerian Independence Day, October 1.

Contradiction: Building the Development structures in the area, and the Management structures in the village to cope with the monumental projects involved in transition. (Wk. 7)

## DOUALA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Nigerian professor agrees to open up channels to Ivory Coast.

Internal: House celebrates coming together after four weeks of being dispersed.

Contradiction: Moving specifically without restricting options. (Wk. 9)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two circuit teams confirm 12 events for Week 9 and another 16 events for Week 4 of next quarter. Continent celebrates victory of colleague minister in Ruhr Valley who staged adoption of El Bayad by their synod (by unanimous vote of 120) for 50,000 DM this year. New Decade Voyage (Dec. 27 - Jan. 1) letter is prepared for mailing.

Internal: Area priorship gathers to check signals on Sunday and reaffirm decision to operate as one area in maneuvers for the eight regions we care for.

Contradiction: Finding ways and seeing opportunities to build the movement in the midst of setting up events. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Fifty selling stalls and a special edition of the *Laterne* mark the momentum of Christmas market. Phone call from colleague in Vienna announces a scheduled GWF. Linn Cary calls on Social Welfare official in Neukolln and receives an offer to participate in any program needed to be done there.

Internal: Area prior and Management team presence allow new burst of corporate power on the limited liability company, cafe strategy, and quarter plans.

Contradiction: Translating the momentum of single events into continuing structures. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Framing workshop includes four Guardians.

Internal: Slide presentation with Ben Beker at guest night portrays strong image of engagement potential for all colleagues.

Contradiction: Creating the image, *Town Meeting for Netherlands*, while showing up very non-Dutch in set-up calls. (Wk. 9)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Village Forum Team II arrives back from Solwezi (Kitwe Metro) with the victory of doing 20 Village Forums in two weeks, bringing the total to 40 Forums in 40 weeks. The *Twenty Acres* farm crew reports that 15 acres are cleared and ready for plowing.

Internal: House gathers with representatives from each stake to plan the state DOOP model.

Contradiction: Keeping community momentum flowing when family plowing must be done. (Wk. 9)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Three year celebration, a great week-long event in itself with stake story and symbol workshops, two nights of cinema, and 100 cases of in-kind Pepsi sets tone for nothing less than victory as procurement team successfully wrestles desert pipe through paperwork, final "yes" is said to land permission for desert project and the school receives piped water from the Bayad system.

Internal: Telling the Bayad story while hosting visitors on walking tours of the village impresses both visitors and staff with the miracle Bayad is.

Contradiction: Guiding the Community Development Association through a minefield of ancient prejudices to a position where it can benefit from the new openness of the Social Affairs Department. (Wk. 8)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Head of USAID mission in Kenya visits Kawangware and Kamweleni and responds with, "I didn't realize anything like this was going on in Kenya". National replication trek team reports, "Things are going very well." Kawangware and Kabiro maneuvers are created for the *Two Month Miracle March*. Firestone Managing Director creates proposal for ICA towards 300,000 K. Shs. grant. HDTI participants are taken home to vote and return for great Heritage Excursion.

Internal: Margot Lovett returns and plugs into in-kind post with great passion. Mr. Dethe does collegium on Training Facility and provides window into the future relative to space requirements.

Contradiction: Discerning the critical immediate tactics that allow time for futuristic tactics to be realized. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell, community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Nexus undertakes massive materials preparation for 60 Consults and Project directors' training for 60 new Projects in advance of division guns and support forces meeting hosted in Bombay.

Internal: Panchayat visits Nexus.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategies to complete, sustain, fund, and celebrate the 232 over the next four months with an eye on next year. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The six week Global Methods School with the 60 giants of Nava Gram Prayas is underway in Maliwada. Site visits take place in villages where private company adoptions are being considered. NSIC, a government corporation, is encouraging a 50 loom unit in Maliwada for spinning yarn. It will employ over 100 people and will be the first of its kind in Maharashtra.

Internal: Nexus troops are disbursed to do continental patrol, project monitoring, and authorization.

Contradiction: Maintaining faithfulness to strategic maneuvers while handling mountains of immediacies and ongoing tasks. (Wk. 9)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: Meeting with local bank manager sets stage for integrated loan financing for the whole village and begins frantic week of house to house loan survey. After Maliwada and Sikror site visits, Danida promises major support for Maharashtra Actuation.

Internal: Fine celebration with Chinese and Indian dishes and fireworks marks Diwali (goddess of wealth) and begins major agency Development push.

Contradiction: Creating solid maneuvers to complete the year's work by December for first year celebration in Sikror. (WK. 7)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Villagers start building a 150 feet stone and cement drain with voluntary labor.

Internal: Auxiliary spends the morning cleaning the house and caps the day with dinner and movie at Sangareddy.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to make visits to government departments in spite of heavy farm work. (Wk. 11)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Twelve impact events are scheduled in the set-up phase of campaign.

Internal: House hosts Guardian couple and Canadian visitors (Bill Staples' mom and friend) for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Creating a practical strategy that allows House to break loose impact in Regions Calcutta and Asansol. (Wk. 7)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House raises over 45,000 USD during last two weeks with 33,000 raised in Week 5.

Internal: House welcomes the Pauls en route to Medan.

Contradiction: Getting the move over so House can move on. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTS and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Contact with Customs reveals to the Customs Director that even though the process for ICA tax exemption was started by them two years ago it was still not completed. Government plans to build a new Tadika for Sungai Lui. The Post Office moves to Pasar.

Internal: In-house celebration during heavy thunder storm and lights out sets mood for profound reflection on the week.

Contradiction: Enabling villagers to be able to articulate the victory of the Project to visitors. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Signal futuric meeting happens in Kampung Dahung. Government officials representing several departments give permission and confidence that government, ICA and community will be working together. New secretariat is formed and given official approval by local government.

Internal: House travels to wedding of Hasan (KD auxiliary) and Leti (15 year old bride). Kite flying season begins and Dirk's birthday are celebrated with three layered Indonesian cake.

Contradiction: Holding tension between placing the Project responsibility on village secretariat and revving up actuation. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: HDTS is launched with 30 staff and 70 participants with six of seven Coastal Village Growth Centers represented. Group includes three government officials, five from transmigration project in Central Sumatra, and others are villagers. Whole Training School goes to five coastal villages to launch Bubun Cluster with first DOOP. First USD 12,500 in bank.

Internal: House celebrates Mohd Ibrahim's (from India) 27th birthday and welcomes Tom Holt, three month sojourner from St. Olaf College in Minnesota, as HDTS participant.

Contradiction: Doing practices and building curriculum while School is going on. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP

External: Framing visits with area prior to Kabupaten (County) and Provincial Government uncover deep consensus to use Bontoa as model and to expand across the province with a promise of total financial support. Village decides the five major victories for November: Mosque, road completion, water system, women's classes and Town Meetings. First TV owned by villager creates great excitement in the village.

Internal: House doubles in number with arrival of 4 KKN (university student volunteers) and area prior. Great celebration climaxed the week with the movie, *Wild Geese* and dessert in Ujung Pandang.

Contradiction: Deepening the village context to match provinial demand for replication. (Wk. 9)

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Documentation is launched in Hai Ou using a two week model by two staff from Nexus.

Internal: Celebrative and reflective life begin to get their stride within events such as a myth conversation and the Islam seminary.

Contradiction: Articulating the perimeters without having effective methods to do so. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Foundation Directors meet at Nam Wai project center to discuss government's response to its solicitor and alteration in articles of incorporation. Guardians, Prescott and Richards, revive directors interest in Nam Wai land plan development.

Internal: Week II is celebrative with three birthdays including the one month birthday of Katherine Shing.

Contradiction: Securing positioning vis-a-vis the government in order to take the next missional steps in Hong Kong. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Community center budget is worked through and materials including steel, 200 bags of cement and 15,000 bricks are in-kind with transport. Card index system for Development is finished. Forth village youth meeting is held.

Internal: House fasts Wednesday on behalf of the Taiwan Expansion Program.

Contradiction: Using building momentum to break loose transition images in community. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: World Bank official visits Philippines and makes progress in negotiating Project with government officials stopping to brief ICA as he departs.

Internal: Anne Conroy and Dan Tuecke arrive for Development trek and cultural orientation.

Contradiction: Doubling size of HDTS facility during period of low income. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Continuing Quarter II Development effort results in USD 2,000 deposited for the week. LENS set-up appointments are set for Week 7 with 10 key companies in Taipei.

Internal: Taipei staff returns from first week of documentation trek in Hai Ou. Great ecclesiola with Nyreere study is on target in terms of situation in Asia.

Contradiction: Generating new Development sources while raising enough immediate money to support task. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Barangay captains across Mactan gather in Training School to plan the 24 December Consults. Design to be used for the 24 signs and for T-shirts for 1,200 children and their ELNC teachers combines Iron Man and the First Lady's national nutrition slogan *Healthy Child, Healthy Nation*. Training School builds pedicab waiting shelter during workday and surprises barangay captains with the physical part of the curriculum. Cluster ELC teachers decide to close ELC's in December to join Consult team.

Internal: Blase Sands joins area prior in Davao to write AID proposal. House participates as guests of honor in Lapu Lapu fiesta.

Contradiction: Deciding to move into the guest room we've been saving for the Messiah. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: First batch of cacao pods arrive to produce 4,000 seedlings; 3,000 are sent to the Valancia HDP, and 1,000 to Carmen HDP for germination. Harvest of first ovaltine crop begins and five new plots are completed in demonstration farm. Financial statements are completed for all five general stores in all five Projects showing increased profits.

Internal: House celebrates birthday of Emerging Generation, Alan Estorgio.

Contradiction: Getting someone trained to keep the pump and generator going under increasing loads. (Wk. 9)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Third TM is held for Mitsui Shipbuilding Co. in company apartment buildings in Chiba prefecture. TM dates are set in Shizuoka and Yamanashi prefectures. Follow-up visit to Uenohara results in GWF date and commitment of 10 women to take a GSD trip to Sudtonggan.

Internal: Monthly advisors (Guardians) dinner at the House is attended by 10 key colleagues, four of whom are new. All have been or will be TM leaders at Seibu store, demonstrating that engagement builds commitment.

Contradiction: Keeping it all tied together so that there is just one movement doing one great task. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twelve leaders reflect together on Park's vision.

Internal: President Park's life and death honored.

Contradiction: Building the Army of Humanness in time. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House conducts refresher workshop training for elite Ewha Girls School faculty. Purchase of 10 dairy calves for demonstration farm is lined up to initiate Project herd. The service of 50 medical students is offered for health clinic module boost in villages surrounding Project.

Internal: All are deeply impressed by poise and calm of citizens in Seoul amidst sudden death of President Park.

Contradiction: Finding the ways and the means to allow self-support to enable rather than overwhelm the external task. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Government purchases seven hogs at a price substantially higher than the going market. Evaluation consult starts with over 70 villagers in attendance for the two days.

Internal: A very welcome stove is erected in the middle of the collegium room in response to a 12 degree introduction to winter.

Contradiction: Getting the TM Wagon started in sub-freezing weather. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: TM packets are ready to mail to 297 Social Education Community Centers in Ehime prefecture. Toyonaga sets-up appointments in Shimane and arranges a translator from Shimono-Seki.

Internal: House spends four days on beautiful sea coast at Jesuit retreat house in fishing village of Kiyu.

Contradiction: Focusing on Week 8 collegial gathering in the midst of completing other projects. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A week of pushing in-kind development proves that

it can be done. Paper and chairs are secured and good leads are developed for replacing the House's undersized and terminally ailing refrigerator. And one colleague calls to offer an American turkey for Thanksgiving.

Internal: Although rain cancels a planned trip to Kyoto, the picnic comes off on schedule on the green turf of the collegium room carpet.

Contradiction: Naming the death ground that focuses all missional engagement. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: Oyubari residents, Miss Nakajima and Mr. Kobayashi, prepare for trip to Philippines with nightly English classes.

Internal: In Week II of dispersion Mrs. Sato visits family in Haboro, Miss Hur arrives at Academy in Chicago, and Butchers visit cultural centers in Sapporo.

Contradiction: Keeping village moving with troops dispersed. (Wk. 8)

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Meeting with youth group results in firm plans for six Community Youth Forums to be held with other forums in Ku-ring-qui shire early in the new year.

Internal: Spin by clergy colleague on *Ladder of Human Liberation* intrigues House with a journey of consciousness through secular language.

Contradiction: Breaking loose strategizing time for the keystone on immediacies. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: RS-1 calling continues with reflection on current strategy and broadening it. Workshops are held to build screens for State Advisory Board and broaden permeation strategy.

Internal: Perth House roster is complete with the arrival of Barbara and Marissa Hawley. House celebrates with "sherry" hour at the Sheraton.

Internal: House's Halloween celebration has exciting mysterious impact in the village as children play masked games and get a good scare at haunted fun house.

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: Staff visits two Regional Planning Districts and Department of Agriculture LENS is held with 22 top level managers and the Commissioner. Global film is shown to Sisters of St. Joseph at Crookston, Minnesota. Contradiction: Discerning the networks for releasing the grassroots the moment the official final contract nod is given. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: New people are engaged in the leadership of the

November community task-forces on health, safety, and holiday planning. Preschool in-kind victories of apple cider, cookies, bread and three carpets excite the staff. HDTs recruitment continues as a few people consider attending one of the cycles.

Internal: Youth participate in soccer tournament that completes the season.

Contradiction: Shifting gears from isolated events to encompass broad geographical areas larger than a region and with many diversified groups. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Church section is the hotspot in RS-I held Nov. 16-18 drawing 20 participants from St. Louis, Chicago, Louisville and four Indiana cities. ICA joins with a coalition of agencies to plan a comprehensive impact series for the northeast side of Indianapolis, with the CYF and TM component funded by Indiana Committee for the Humanities. Two lectures on our strategy and approach to graduate school social work students draws depth response and concern over how to live the long march of care.

Contradiction: Focusing dissipated House energy. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Development comes to town with the result of \$1300 raised, \$1600 committed and \$5000 working. Highlights of the week include a strategy workshop for Development's next visit and the decision to prepare a Cleveland report.

Internal: Needed transformation in the Daily Office room and office are accomplished.

Contradiction: Coordinating multiple neighborhood events into one thrust. (Wk. 8)

**NEW YORK****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Five global slide shows and films are held, with one in Scardale and four on Long Island. Blue Skies Maneuver to frame the area and firm up Project economic programs, documenting significant Project results for framing, is planned by Area and Nexus troops.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates the birthday of Margarita Lara and farewell of Robert Hornewr at a nearby restaurant, with plenty of ice cream, cake and wine.

Contradiction: Finding the time to step back from the hectic activities of this quarter, to appraise Sol's course at mid-quarter. (Wk. 9)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: The Junior Health Caretakers participate in an excursion to Rio Bonito to visit a dentist and a hospital, which is

the first time out of Bananeiras for many of them. Three women are sent to Rio de Janeiro for bakery training with Fleischmann Yeast's baking school. Chemicals are in-kind from EMATER-Rio to nurture sprouting plants. Home gardens numbers 22 and 23 go up, one of them is the demonstration covered garden. The after-school program, dressed in yellow scarves with the program symbol, cleans, weeds and whitewashes rocks for the preschool on Community Day.

Contradiction: Refocusing the thrust of the Project for the next six weeks to build on victories that are at hand. (Wk. 8)

Agriculture Guild continues to meet. First harvest of Chinese peas is marketed. Electricity is installed in wicker industry and production continues at night. Evening with the Institute invitations are mailed and room is in-kind at Hotel El Dorado Americana.

Internal: House sends Eliseo and Geronima out to Asherton HDP for the year.

Contradiction: Eliciting new local auxiliaries now that some of the original auxiliaries are on global assignment. (Wk. 9)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP**

External: Area grid completion and quarter GCF plan open GCF campaign in virgin territory of Peru.

Internal: Cadre visits over two day holiday and brings a 15 kilo fish for celebration.

Contradiction: Clearing the boards and transferring information to allow Development maneuver victory. (Wk. 8)

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports major success in funding from religious bodies, including Maryknoll (India) and Sisters of Charity (Brussels). Major funding request to Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association (PMA) draws near decision date (Dec. 5) with presentations to International and Public Relations Boards of PMA. European continental tracking system is in place in every House. State campaigns and HDP transitions are beginning to provide positive entrees for Development. The key contradiction lies in the arena of generating a larger number of middle-range contributors (\$1000-\$5000) to support monthly program support base plus reduce accumulated debt to a liveable level.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports from Brussels Nexus on the framing trek to the Isle of Dogs as a step in the creation of a new relationship to the community. Chicago enables three pilot Voyages in Houston, San Francisco and Detroit. Brussels makes the discovery that relating to a mature project consists of accelerating the project, assisting the project with its frame and extending the community care to the world. The key contradiction lies in the arena of reporting systems to enable the various Nexus to be on top of their responsibility.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports that LENS is going strong around the world with 39 companies participating in past LENS courses in Singapore and 10 more contacted for the future. Among other North American LENS courses, one is held in Chicago with Planned Parenthood. Area expansion workshops in Brussels involve strategies for West Africa and geo-social analysis of Area Stockholm. Professor Fabian Udekwu (Vice President of ICA: Nigeria) shares his brooding relative to social and political trends in Western Africa. A breakthrough is experienced as endorsement letters are received from local community mayors for ICA programs. The key contradiction lies in the arena of experiencing the one thrust of the mission and building coordinated systems for back-up and decision making

## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Global Management Centrum reports that this has been a week of completing reports. Hong Kong Nexus completed two ICA reports, and Brussels got its House condition reports in readiness to print. In Chicago the entire Fiscal Services Post took a three day course in "Non-profit Financial Management", offered by the Transcentury Foundation, funded by US AID, and the instructor was a 1968 La Paz Bolivia RS-I grad. ITI materials are printed for eight ITIs. The breakthrough was in the arena of grant management clarity and cash flow projections. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building the long term plan that adequately handles a backlog of tasks, cross-centrum coordination, as well as immediate must do's.
