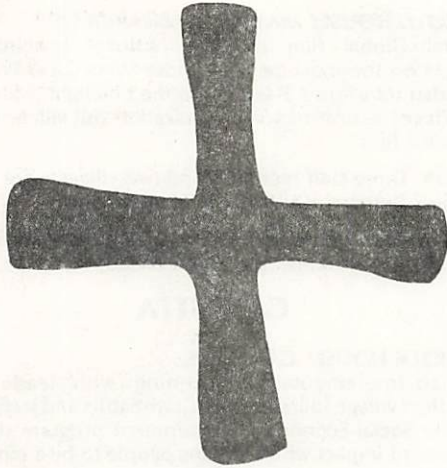

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON—ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Six TM events completed in Kingston-upon-Thames include three training sessions with local steering committee to produce eight local workshop leaders. Stan Windass, Opportunities for Alternatives, London, writes to inquire about attending Continental Formation Fortnight. Tai'rgwaith Community Center foundation is completed. Edinburgh holds all-women TM.

Internal: Area House hosts Panchayat trek which is highlighted by open house with Guardians and Isle of Dogs representatives in the transformed collegium space.

Contradiction: Dealing skillfully with all the immediacies and last quarter's odds and sods while launching Quarters IV and I. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Edinburgh Forum for women has 23 present and is orchestrated by house and regional colleagues. Participants request a follow-up event and Rosemary Fleming says, "I'll do it." A meeting with 10 professional community workers in Levenmouth elicits a request for methods training and more events.

Internal: House celebrates its first week together in five weeks by building a snowman as five inches of snow falls on the first day of spring.

Contradiction: Anticipating new circuit configurations to cover the area and follow-up circuits in present configuration. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Bristol circuit nets two seriously considering Formation Fortnight and sets date for first ecclesiola with colleagues in Bristol. Village completes building foundation and levels ground.

Internal: Area circuit team assigned to Bristol and Dublin Regions meets to create Project backup maneuvers.

Contradiction: Enabling community to see future economic node as a crucially needed demonstration of the economic viability of villages in Wales. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Twenty-four hour trek opens up another local network for set possibilities.

Internal: Panchayat trek, Regional trek and Continental Council occasion looking at House, Regional and Areal mission from a variety of perspectives re-enforcing "on behalf of" tactics.

Contradiction: Building the concrete models and maneuvers which move toward finely tuned and well-coordinated timelines reflecting our rapidly exploding context. (Wk. 13)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: First six hour *Encuentro Comunitario* (TM) in Spain, complete with seven page document, is held for 40 key leaders of six villages in Southern Avila Province. They said: "We've worked on some issues before but we've never organized ourselves to focus on all of them like this." Next step is to start on set of six villages at the end of April.

Internal: Clancy Mann visits and helps prepare constitution of *Instituto de Asuntos Culturales de Espana* for its final stage of registration.

Contradiction: Finding HDP site before July. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Movement finalizes and enables the participation of 11 from France in Formation Fortnight.

Internal: Festive dinner sends out Parker family to established Abidjan House, Dominique Mathiot to Academy, and Penelope Portman to GWF trek in Nigeria.

Contradiction: Continuing Awakening Campaign when all stops are out for training and Formation Fortnight. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Fourth replication project consult is completed with great response from village residents. Site for village in Rift Valley is selected. Continental Council in Kawangware, with colleagues from Areas Kinshasa, Lagos, and Nairobi present, decides and recommends a continued decision to create the network that holds continent as one and is the sign of the future for the globe.

Internal: Area Nairobi experiences unbelievable resettlement with 133 troops in at least eight locations; Nairobi House receives 10 new troops while 19 old hands remain.

Contradiction: Coordinating different missional fronts. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breaklooses occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: A delegation of four from the National Council of Women from Norway visits and experiences Sikror new visibility as accomplishment chart is painted and major Shramdan happens in temple area. Villagers accept hosting responsibility and new decision emerges as Stake One holds extra stake meeting to arrange electricity money collection.

Internal: Meneshwar family arrives to take new assignment in Area Delhi, Paulina Prakash returns with Dhanoud and Sheila and Global Development Centrum circuit team visits Sikror.

Contradiction: Formulating effective models to release auxiliary and villager responsibility into solid tactical actuation. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Global film showing captures imagination of villagers on the movement of Those Who Care. Whitewash shramdan transforms Stake 4 into the limelight. Members of the Village Reconstruction Organization visit village and view the global film.

Internal: Three staff members and two villagers are assigned to Global Research Colloquy in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Reinvigorating village structures which seem like a glacier in their sluggishness. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Implementation planning with leaders from Kalikidhari village following the Gram Sabha and staff training with the Social-Economic Development program signal the shift toward impact which equips people to be a movement.

Internal: The House is sustained by the task; circuits continue even though we're spread across the continent.

Contradiction: Articulating West Bengal stories and victories to release intensified local participation. (Wk. 3)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: WEDGE trek concludes in fine style with area prior at Nexus and document detailing region-by-region consensus on strategies for Area Singapore.

Internal: House hosts Sandy Powell's parents, the Conants from Waco, Texas, and celebrates three emerging generation birthdays with two parties.

Contradiction: Increasing self-support mechanism for rest of year in midst of very fluid assignments and shifting of anticipated income sources. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Two incredible weeks of non-stop engagement in the first of 24 Community Extension Modules (CEMs) leaves everyone exhausted and awe-filled. History writing of village draws forth the great story tellers. First of series of Town Meetings to be held in Kuala Selangor held day before closing celebration. Module ends with speeches and presentation of plaque of Symbol of 24. Village meets immediately after closing to elect Secretariat and new chairman urges all to work together since this is now their Project.

Internal: Entire Sungai Lui staff moves in with nexus for three days to ensure document and re-writing of procedures manual is completed.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on engagement of past two weeks in order to sustain new decisions. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Health Fair includes weighing of 122 babies. Water is on after four month breakdown thanks to Nurul and Ken Otto. Two sent to CEM in Sungai Lui and stake meetings are reinstated.

Internal: Everyone participates in bringing off Health Fair and close day with games night.

Contradiction: Meeting critical missional imperatives when tactics are exhausted. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: Preschool training held in Tapa Kuda, one of the cluster villages, with 10 future teachers from the cluster villages in attendance. Village assembly in Bubun cements the village decision to go all out for electricity and lighting. Final draft of new extension proposal drawn up after a month of meetings with the team Desa Pantai (ICA's partnership agency in North Sumatra).

Internal: Dick West sent out to Kuala Lumpur for LENS trek and Sungai Lui extension consult.

Contradiction: Telling the winning story while the battle is raging all around us. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Preschool restarts following rains and rice planting. Fishpond Guild leaders attend information meeting on World Bank Loan Program for 1%-interest loans now available through the People's Bank of Indonesia (BRI). Bontoa leaders gather to rethink DOOP methods.

Internal: The suspense is over: it's a boy, Robert Joseph Shankland joins staff weighing in at 35 kg. (7.75 lbs) and 52 cm. (20.5 in.)

Contradiction: Finding the story that allows staff and village to move it amidst deafening silence from the government about HDS proposal and Year II budgets. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: LENS Demonstration to Chinese business community gives new indicators of how to be of service in Hong Kong. Sungai Lui Community Extension Module report is heard. Hoicombs, along with John Epps, are sent to assist Oyubari's CEM.

Internal: Easter spirit is enlivened with Easter House Church banquet and witness on the resurrection followed by attendance at local churches.

Contradiction: Shifting images of Summer '80 from a panacea to a locus of sharing active models for the future. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Board holds a meeting with Immanuel Ko. Present. Board agrees to hire him as new lawyer for Nam Wai Foundation when a quorum says yes. Documentation is completed.

Internal: House deeply appreciates Joe Croker's visit to Nam Wai. Chairman hosts House, some Board members, and Joe for lunch in Ho Chung.

Contradiction: Maintaining a sociological perspective on development and not a romantic one. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: National recognition of Hai Ou as a demonstration community attracts 300 government officials from Ping Tung County for spot tour. As the grand opening for the Hai Ou Center draws near the village is busy and excited: building grounds are cleared, floor tiling is completed, invitations are printed, second women's meeting is held, and third edition of Hai Ou newspaper is printed.

Internal: Midweek celebration of candlelight, wine, and spaghetti dinner with Taipei colleagues provides reflection in the midst of intense do-ment.

Contradiction: Journeying the leadership towards transition responsibilities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Area Council meets at Manila Peninsula Hotel. Twelve point program is outlined for Area in 1980-81. Development makes 43 appointments and deposits 27,000. Thirty cases of noodles are in-kind for HDS. 1979 ICA: Manila audit is completed and published.

Internal: House hosts 10 dynamic young Japanese colleagues from Osaka on visit to Manila, Legaspe, and Mactan.

Contradiction: Intensifying present advantages while giving the new creative form. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Quarter IV assignments and tasks take shape in light of four year images of human development cluster formation. Development correspondence consisting of proposals, thank-you letters, and contribution receipts are sent out.

Internal: House celebrates Palm Sunday Common Meal at the start of Holy Week.

Contradiction: Obtaining consensus in both regional Houses on the island concerning the sequencing of events and maneuvers for Quarter IV. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: City of Lapu Lapu reaffirms support of 24 villages by approval of 1980 budget which includes 36 blueshirt honorariums, national nutrition jeep with gas, and preschool supplies. Peso signs flash as movie star agrees to do benefit concert for Early Learning Nutrition Centers and spirit flashes as 80 village blueshirts go through Voyage. Fourth HDS set with 100% of staff from Philippines and one-third of participants full paying.

Internal: Crack cluster troops reconfigure to cover three fronts: HDS, 24 village actuation, and economic push with Export Processing Zone. Globe claims Mary Lou Vergara and Ben Aguirang for Academy.

Contradiction: Getting the most out of troops day after day after day. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: In the six projects—Valancia, Luman, Carman, LaPaz, Magtuad and Langub—223 children are enrolled in eight preschools. Workdays involving over 100 people prepare the preschool buildings; activity includes painting and cleaning classrooms and building toilet, tables, chairs and even frames for entire school. A total of 81 farmers sign up for farmers' class on air-a-radio program.

Internal: The ecclesiola study keeps everybody spinning.

Contradiction: Finishing the second weighing of all children by the end of the month. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Continental Formation Fortnight facility is found for training program in April.

Internal: Ecclesiola on the "Paths of Glory" is held with two movement couples present.

Contradiction: Finding ways to build practical constructs to respond to anticipated and unanticipated demands. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Circuits nail down participation of nine people in the Primal Community: The Next Decade Research and Training Fortnight. Guardian hosts dinner with key people in Lige Metro putting a stake in Wallania frame.

Internal: Movement event shifts visitors into colleagues at Panchayat visitation concert.

Contradiction: Accelerating awakening sets while focusing on training and formulation. (Wk. 3)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP**

External: Training fortnight send out catalyzes Co-op decision to take responsibility for monthly planning. Two orders come in. Milan circuit returns with patrons' event set for June.

Internal: House celebration trip to Pompeii and Vesivius is a contemplation exercise on community 2000 years ago.

Contradiction: Creating tactics that hold the troop/time tension and allow Quarter IV victory in all six regions. (Wk. 3)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP**

External: Miraculous intervention of Professor Udekwo rescinds repatriation order on two and reactivates process of registration. Mufutan Jimoh, Sewing Factory Manager, gets new contracts—one with possible total of \$38,400 (N24,000). Key TM held at Umuzike-Orlu, Imo State with 300 present, led by two auxiliary and two Ijedians.

Internal: House celebrates arrival of Ray Spencer, Neil Vance and Bill Parker with fantastic Saturday night feast and great House Church.

Contradiction: Enabling events in the village which create corporateness and sustain consistent victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Gerald Nani, French Guardian, joins Biel on two-week framing and authorization trek through West Africa.

Internal: Suzanne completes hospital stay and starts back to work again.

Contradiction: Doing comprehensive job on base maneuvers without having the benefit of corporate input (Wk. 10)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: After two weeks of extensive circuits and phone calls 18 people from eight regions are committed for the Formation Fortnight with more than 30 still considering attending. House spends Week II on documentation of Town Meeting, writing stories of Gemeindeforum and follow-up and creating visual charts of challenges and geographic coverage to serve as data for the Fortnight's work.

Internal: Holy Week includes canonical hours, Scripture readings, mural, 10 minutes in the Dark Night, watching the *Gospel According to St. Matthew* on TV, Passion music, two space miracles in the basement, and quarter battle-planning.

Contradiction: Finding corporate time for the corporate task. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: One day of metro circuiting nets three registrations for Formation Fortnight with four Project leaders strongly considering. Week of more in-kind and Development victories by Project Development Taskforce is highlighted by 15,000 DM professional lay-out and new plate-making machine. Area council, United Nations conference, and youth group from Hamburg make Kreuzberg Ost the center of the whirlwind.

Internal: House Church, after area council with four regional colleagues present, celebrates area prior's birthday and sends Margreet Farid out to Academy.

Contradiction: Thinking "big" when small not only seems beautiful but realistic as well. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Appointment with a Catholic school of theology and pastoral training reveals interest in training its students in social methods.

Internal: Second job permit is received after two month's wait.

Contradiction: Getting practical tasks done in midst of whirlwind. (Wk. 12)

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: House hosts 12 during local authorization event after returning from Continental Council with formulation models.

Internal: Lis leaves for Sydney to sit for medical examinations and Unicom News in London communicates interest for part-time employment with travel expenses for a Scandinavian representative.

Contradiction: Establishing the "Team of Ten". (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP**

External: Village Forum teams return from a 16-day circuit in Central Province with victory of 84 forums. One of these is a follow-up assembly called by a particular headman—105 villages and 900 people are present. Kabwe CYF has 54 participants representing three schools.

Internal: Saturday night of role playing recent experiences celebrates Village Forum and CYF.

Contradiction: Breaking loose funding while companies are closing books at financial year end. (Wk. 3)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP**

External: First LENS in Egypt held with International Computers, Ltd. is successful demonstration of helpful method for enabling companies and employees to benefit from local people's increasing readiness to participate in creating the future.

Internal: Egyptian staff take the reins of the Bayad Project and gun all arenas, demonstrating increasing methodological prowess and indigenous insights into effective modes of operation in the tan ur.

Contradiction: Enabling the villagers to take responsibility for everyday decisions in the economic and social programs. (Wk. 3)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Extraordinary visit with US Ambassador Mansfield, made through and with Guardian Harry Olsen, Arthur Anderson head and president of the American Chamber of Commerce in Tokyo, opens the way to meeting the Ambassador of the Peoples Republic of China as a key step in building an ICA China strategy.

Internal: New resident, Miss Kikumori, moves in, and Mr. Sashiwa continues his ICA traveling by spending four days in Oyubari during the CEM.

Contradiction: Pushing our spring timeline in creative tension with the decision making process of governments and businesses. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Two weeks of HDP documentation declares the great victory of the past four years as a quadrupled village income is revealed.

Internal: Momentous leap in Order membership is celebrated as House receives as interns three men: Lee Kang Jin, Lee Ho Sung, and Park Yung Chul.

Contradiction: Building the intensive campaign that will create the network of Human Development villages. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The first regional Guardians event in a long time is a great happening. Breakfast at the Seoulin Hotel enables telling of current breakthroughs in all three locations. Key Guardians rehearse the cruciality of ICA to their work.

Internal: Three new Jeju interns stop by on their way to HDTs while two from Kuh Du E Ri are doing set-up and two from Seoul drop in to find out what is going on.

Contradiction: Creating instant Development results in a situation that requires long term relationships. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Victory! Sixty-two TMs are held in the last three weeks. One hundred are done in Chun Song county.

Internal: Park So Hyun celebrates birthday in House and Mr. Han's celebration is held in village.

Contradiction: Getting total area and regional picture and how to move. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Grassroots Development pledge form and new ICA brochure (both in fine Japanese) are sent to over 30 regional colleagues. Akimichi Watanabe long-time volunteer decides to attend Tokyo Advisors Meeting. Colleagues gather for International Night on Sunday and share global stories.

Internal: Ecclesiola begins with Mr. Tsurada attending.

Contradiction: Meshing the Quarter IV regional plan with the national/area maneuvers and needs. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Mid-course correction planning signals arrival of Quarter IV. Mally Balm has fine appointment with a leading Indian professor in Japan who is the nephew of Tagore. Second work day solidifies relationship with Vietnamese refugee camp in Nara Prefecture.

Internal: Maundy Thursday and Easter morning House Church feasts highlight Holy Week.

Contradiction: Continuing the victorious creativity of last quarter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO—OYUBARI HDP

External: Nihon Cable Company sends two representatives to Oyubari to do preliminary ski course site selection. Ski Committee climbs ski mountain three times to take pictures and movies and draw sketches. TM is set up with Nambu Youth Group.

Internal: Walter Blackledge comes from Osaka to help prepare for extension module and stiffen the spine of our filing system.

Contradiction: Controlling anxiety about the slowness of community consensus building with everyone together. (Wk. 3)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The great week of jumping through the hoops includes Shire Council office space assigned to the Wyong circuit team, 600 "Have-a-Go-Gazettes" mailed out, postage in-kind and 33 development visits held resulting in \$1,400 in-hand cash.

Internal: Hosting is the name of the game with development task team and Debbie Farley on her return from Salani ITI stopping in.

Contradiction: Intensifying the "set" set-up while maintaining a low profile necessitated by flaccid flame. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Second CMA is held in Bullsbrook with 21 in attendance producing proposals to set up Progress Association and outline what it will do. Moora attributes its decision to build senior citizens' homes and a recreation center to a combined service clubs CMA done a year ago.

Internal: Bruce's red roses marketing strategy is adopted by his company.

Contradiction: Appropriating the victories and defeats of this campaign. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: House is sparked by stories of Area Stockholm as Liz Banks visits for three days. In-kind material is packaged and sent to Murrin Bridge to the sewing industry.

Internal: Final ecclesiola of the quarter pushes House and colleagues to witness to events.

Contradiction: Rehearsing the comprehensive story to sustain local troops while deciding to risk new engagement arenas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Southwest Victoria set events which include Afternoon with the Institute, CYF, and CMA, involves 75 people. Murrin Bridge's second year report is published and bound. Development taskforce submits report to Alcoa and Ross Foundation for funding CMAs.

Internal: Area fast, ecclesiola with colleagues, and quarter celebration to see *The China Syndrome* spiritize week of reflection in midst of our doing.

Contradiction: Maneuvering internally and externally into the next quarter. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA—MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Community uses seminar report as basis for week's planning and sets off new initiatives in research for possible industries. Murrin Bridge Magpies win local football final for the first time ever. Community receives Art Board grant to expand screen printing.

Internal: Auxiliary takes part in kangaroo hunt and feasts on kangaroo tail soup.

Contradiction: Creating effective structures which remind community of reality of its situation and call forth its creative response. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Community Meeting held by candlelight in Wondai and two set up meetings yield another Community Meeting scheduled.

External: Maryknoll grant is received for Community Extension Consult, Training Module, HDTs, and Community Forums.

Internal: Sojourner gives first Daily Office witness on his changed lifestyle to mark his intensified journey.

Contradiction: Allowing a story of "the government is doing it all" to stifle community incentive. (Wk. 3)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

Preschool teachers receive first stipend out of fees paid by children.

Internal: Percy Moore of Claverty Cottage brings copies of CC Consult Document and stays for closing of the Training Module.

Contradiction: Orchestrating other people's engagement in readiness for Quarter IV. (Wk. 3)

External: Mobil Oil volunteers legal assistance and Southern Peru Copper Company assigns their own lawyer to complete the registration procedures. The youth of Azpitia take a trip to Lima, the first time they have planned and carried out a group trip. Demonstration chicken house is built in less than three days.

Internal: House rejoices in the end of a month long mail strike and ends the week by finishing its maneuvers and timeline for Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Using short time and shifting staff to advantage. (Wk. 3)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports ITT check of \$100,000; 40 calls which release \$7,000 U.S. in Hong Kong; and approval of EEC grant for Kapini after 2 1/2 years of waiting. Motivation comes from a steady beat combined with the discontinuous (illustrated by the CEM Telethon in Chicago) and telling the story in such a way that people can see through to the happening (illustrated by calls in Hong Kong). The key contradiction is determining critical priorities in the face of fewer troops in some locations or more troops and bigger payables in other locations, and then contexting ourselves so that we stand before our decisional priorities.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Hong Kong sets the pace as it prints and mails ecclesiola books to its zone before any other Nexus. Preparation for the Global Research Assembly goes on with the pull-together of Profound Humanness data, the continuing study of Tillich and the preparation of the Global Research Assembly 1980 collegiums. Edge spirit materials bubble up in every corner of the band in the form of phenomenology of glory and new constructs for the fast. The mutuality of spirit brooding and new movement formation becomes clear in the midst of intensified considerations. The key contradiction is discerning what it is we are elected to do in the midst of the march to Summer '80 and the multiplicity of immediate demands.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the completion of the Extension Module in Sungai Lui, the excitement over the completion of the Kwang Yung II document and the recruitment of 15 so far to the Continental Formation Fortnight. Breakthroughs are in the arena of documentation of the Extension Modules as a part of preparing for Summer '80 and part of releasing the movement to plan the next four years. The key contradiction is shaping the use of the Extension Module and the HDTs in each locale to help "jump" the mission there.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Staff return from New York Area Council and Canadian audit and are sent out to Edmonton Area Council. Newly bound and printed ICA fiscal journals are presented to all of the Houses at the Continental Council in Brussels. The Hong Kong Council produces a new quarter's budget. The key contradiction is scheduling Madrid, Copenhagen and Africa for Management Treks while raising and saving money at Chicago Nexus for "The March of the Glorious Quest" to imaginably demonstrate the victories of intentional debt retirement as money comes in.

Stan Windass, Opportunities for Alternatives, London, writes to inquire about attending Continental Formation Fortnight. Tai'rgwaith Community Center foundation is completed. Edinburgh holds all-women TM.

Internal: Area House hosts Panchayat trek which is highlighted by open house with Guardians and Isle of Dogs representatives in the transformed collegium space.

Contradiction: Dealing skillfully with all the immediacies and last quarter's odds and sods while launching Quarters IV and I. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Circuit to Ireland arranges a set of events while dialoguing with eight religious orders and a Dublin business community leader. Plenary in the Ayr Metro set is held in Roman Catholic school and inspires a closing spin by its chaplain.

Internal: Three House members are sent out to the Formation Fortnight in Brussels and one member to extended family in England as the remainder of the House hosts Sr. Rebecca of the Columban Sisters at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Engaging regional colleagues in the long-range. (Wk. 4)

Contradiction: Enabling community to see future economic node as a crucially needed demonstration of the economic viability of villages in Wales. (Wk. 1)

External: During Easter Holiday, Orientation to ICA program is done for six students. One, from Haute Volta, is interested in further participation with ICA and five from North Ireland invite ICA to consult with their community.

Internal: House celebrates Easter with three-hour vigil with Benedictines, and sends out Edith to Formation Fortnight while entertaining seven EG from Brussels.

Contradiction: Expanding space and time to allow for the eventfulness of our lives. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Great prayer meeting with panchayat includes reports on visits to areas in Africa, NAME, and Europe.

Internal: Panchayat celebration involves colleagues from the city in a Julien Bream concert followed by pizza party.

Contradiction: Creating the systems to get through the Fortnight and get a new quarter launched simultaneously. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Circuits nail down participation of nine people in the Primal Community: The Next Decade Research and Training Fortnight. Guardian hosts dinner with key people in Lige Metro putting a stake in Wallania frame.

Internal: Movement event shifts visitors into colleagues at Panchayat visitation concert.

Contradiction: Accelerating awakenment sets while focusing on training and formulation. (Wk. 3)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP

External: Training fortnight send out catalyzes Co-op decision to take responsibility for monthly planning. Two orders come in. Milan circuit returns with patrons' event set for June.

Internal: House celebration trip to Pompeii and Vesuvius is a contemplation exercise on community 2000 years ago.

Contradiction: Creating tactics that hold the troop/time tension and allow Quarter IV victory in all six regions. (Wk. 3)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: Community Planning Day initiates transition into a new quarter. Thirty villagers decide training is crucial—four Project leadership English classes are scheduled. CEM taskforce meets every Saturday to prepare for the new turn. The sewing factory has four new sewing contracts and the in-kind team kicks off its work with a \$175,000 borehole. Local health structure immediately inoculates 50 children for measles when Health Caretakers report measles case in the village.

Internal: Sudden storm blows off roofing of over 50 houses including auxiliary house with no one hurt and many new roofs built in two days.

Contradiction: Formulating new maneuvers quickly enough to gain victory in Quarter IV with broad-based participation. (Wk. 4)

External: One day of metro circuiting nets three registrations for Formation Fortnight with four Project leaders strongly considering. Week of more in-kind and Development victories by Project Development Taskforce is highlighted by 15,000 DM professional lay-out and new plate-making machine. Area council, United Nations conference, and youth group from Hamburg make Kreuzberg Ost the center of the whirlwind.

Internal: House Church, after area council with four regional colleagues present, celebrates area prior's birthday and sends Margreet Farid out to Academy.

Contradiction: Thinking "big" when small not only seems beautiful but realistic as well. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Appointment with a Catholic school of theology and pastoral training reveals interest in training its students in social methods.

Internal: Second job permit is received after two month's wait.

Contradiction: Getting practical tasks done in midst of whirlwind. (Wk. 12)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: House hosts 12 during local authorization event after returning from Continental Council with formulation models.

Internal: Lis leaves for Sydney to sit for medical examinations and Unicom News in London communicates interest for part-time employment with travel expenses for a Scandinavian representative.

Contradiction: Establishing the "Team of Ten". (Wk. 13)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-KAPINI HDP

External: Team of six sent to Northern Province on circuit for Village Forums. Lachman is doing LENS in Egypt while Stoner is at FAO Conference and Continental Council in Kenya. Project residents work through red tape to have health training center changed to clinic. Two brickmakers produce 1,000 bricks in one day.

Internal: Nelson Njenga is sent out to Academy and word is received that Rev. Henry Alimasi is also on his way.

Contradiction: Gap between expectations and support of management group. (Wk. 4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Public sector oil company decides to hold LENS with top management.

Internal: Area taskforce secures flat in Cairo to enable consistent village participation on team.

Contradiction: Getting winning configuration of people, resources, and time in place. (Wk. 4)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Graduation of 62 students from third HDTI held in Kenya is highlight in Nairobi Area Council as 150 gather to celebrate the end of Quarter III, the HDTI graduation, and plan for Quarter IV and the unbelievable task of replication. Colgate-Palmolive and Bata Shoe Co. LENS's are completed opening new global possibilities—Bata has offices in 105 locations. Kenya and Zambia ICA representatives attend FAO conference to present proposals for agricultural programs.

Internal: House joins whole area in preparation for three consults in Weeks 1 and 2 to launch three remaining divisional HDPs in Machakos.

Contradiction: Building structure to coordinate the comprehensive needs of the next three weeks. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcel's Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breaklooses occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

Villagers accept hosting responsibility and new decision emerges as Stake One holds extra stake meeting to arrange electricity money collection.

Internal: Meneshwar family arrives to take new assignment in Area Delhi, Paulina Prakash returns with Dhanoud and Sheila and Global Development Centrum circuit team visits Sikror.

Contradiction: Formulating effective models to release auxiliary and villager responsibility into solid tactical actuation. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Global film showing captures imagination of villagers on the movement of Those Who Care. Whitewash shramdan transforms Stake 4 into the limelight. Members of the Village Reconstruction Organization visit village and view the global film.

Internal: Three staff members and two villagers are assigned to Global Research Colloquy in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Reinvigorating village structures which seem like a glacier in their sluggishness. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: WEDGE trek concludes in fine style with area prior at Nexus and document detailing region-by-region consensus on strategies for Area Singapore.

Internal: House hosts Sandy Powell's parents, the Conants from Waco, Texas, and celebrates three emerging generation birthdays with two parties.

Contradiction: Increasing self-support mechanism for rest of year in midst of very fluid assignments and shifting of anticipated income sources. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Two incredible weeks of non-stop engagement in the first of 24 Community Extension Modules (CEMs) leaves everyone exhausted and awe-filled. History writing of village draws forth the great story tellers. First of series of Town Meetings to be held in Kuala Selangor held day before closing celebration. Module ends with speeches and presentation of plaque :the Symbol of 24. Village meets immediately after closing to elect Secretariat and new chairman urges all to work together since this is now their Project.

Internal: Entire Sungai Lui staff moves in with nexus for three days to ensure document and re-writing of procedures manual is completed.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on engagement of past two weeks in order to sustain new decisions. (Wk.3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: New Nurada sign goes up unexpectedly. Elvie in-kinds more steel and paint for community center.

Internal: Kitchen receives thorough cleaning and paint job which resurrects our spirits.

Contradiction: Creating the strategy which will reflect the leap needed next quarter relative to movementalizing village corps. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: Preschool training held in Tapa Kuda, one of the cluster villages, with 10 future teachers from the cluster villages in attendance. Village assembly in Bubun cements the village decision to go all out for electricity and lighting. Final draft of new extension proposal drawn up after a month of meetings with the team Desa Pantai (ICA's partnership agency in North Sumatra).

Internal: Dick West sent out to Kuala Lumpur for LENS trek and Sungai Lui extension consult.

Contradiction: Telling the winning story while the battle is raging all around us. (Wk.3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Preschool restarts following rains and rice planting. Fishpond Guild leaders attend information meeting on World Bank Loan Program for 1%-interest loans now available through the People's Bank of Indonesia (BRI). Bontoa leaders gather to rethink DOOP methods.

Internal: The suspense is over: it's a boy, Robert Joseph Shankland joins staff weighing in at 35 kg. (7.75 lbs) and 52 cm. (20.5 in.)

Contradiction: Finding the story that allows staff and village to move it admist deafening silence from the government about HDTS proposal and Year II budgets. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Extremely active engagement across the zone launches quarter with development treks, HDTS start-up, two CEMs, and LENS marketing covering all nations.

Internal: Collegiums reflecting on who we are and where we are going reveal a style of preparation for the summer that emphasizes listening to the local and preparing active input rather than raising issues.

Contradiction: Keeping on the edge of active preparation for the long-range future while launching a powerful missional quarter. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Chairman purchases notebooks for all nine Board members and ICA staff. Minutes from the last nine meetings are published for each representative. Board assumes responsibility for writing proposal to government funding for summer sports program.

Internal: Easter barbecue brings together guardian family-John Hall, Nexus representatives, and former ICA staff for a tasty feast.

Contradiction: Running interference for local man in dealing with agencies that think they already know what success is in the local situation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: National recognition of Hai Ou as a demonstration community attracts 300 government officials from Ping Tung County for spot tour. As the grand opening for the Hai Ou Center draws near the village is busy and excited: building grounds are cleared, floor tiling is completed, invitations are printed, second women's meeting is held, and third edition of Hai Ou newspaper is printed.

Internal: Midweek celebration of candlelight, wine, and spaghetti dinner with Taipei colleagues provides reflection in the midst of intense do-ment.

Contradiction: Journeying the leadership towards transition responsibilities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: In-kind for HDTS includes P10,000 worth of food. Ben Aguirang attends Academy and Debbie de Vela visits projects on west coast of USA. Month closes with second largest in-hand cash total recorded.

Internal: House celebrates four day Easter holiday and is especially impacted by the emphasis on Good Friday.

Contradiction: Dealing with global issues in midst of requests for support of specific concerns. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Multi-national corporation executives who have supported Hai Ou HDP over past two years are very favorable toward sponsorship proposal for four-year expansion plan of human development in Taiwan. ICI (China) Limited and Imperial Hotel in Taipei send annual contribution for Hai Ou.

Internal: Two Taipei staff go to Hai Ou to coordinate island-wide extension strategy and assist in Hai Ou programs.

Contradiction: Positioning the private sector for the next major leap of island-wide expansion while funding the new Hai Ou training facility. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Mactan Living Environment Month is in full swing with 120 model Houses entering the semi-finals with pump and beautification workdays in 24 villages. Comprehensive development effort for in-kind and funds in Manila and Cebu—Cebu alone nets P7,000 in-hand, 12,500 committed, and 150,000 working, plus goods ranging from ice cream to paint. HDTS two-week prep turns into advance training school as key Filipino leadership arrives from all over the country.

Internal: Three buildings are renamed Lusaran, Mactan, and Langub to match three groups of participants for HDTS.

Contradiction: Preparing the grassroots leadership that will be the leaders of the third millenium. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

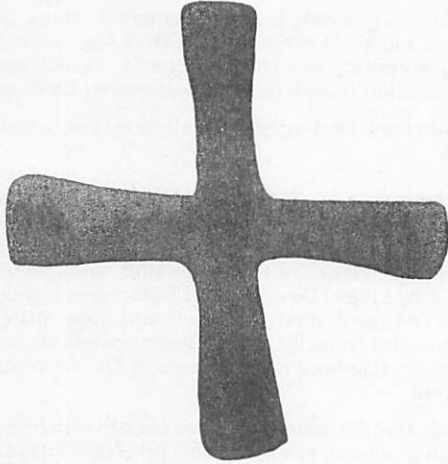

External: Circuit to Ireland arranges a set of events while dialoguing with eight religious orders and a Dublin business community leader. Plenary in the Ayr Metro set is held in Roman Catholic school and inspires a closing spin by its chaplain.

Internal: Three House members are sent out to the Formation Fortnight in Brussels and one member to extended family in England as the remainder of the House hosts Sr. Rebecca of the Columban Sisters at ecclesiola.

Internal: The Madrid House settles into a permanent residence.

Contradiction: Building an ongoing structure for all the volunteers. (Wk. 4)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: ICA brochure translation into French transforms one new translator into an active recruiter.

Internal: Penny Portman returns from a successful GWF/authorization trek in Nigeria.

Contradiction: Expanding space and time to allow for the eventfulness of our lives. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Great prayer meeting with panchayat includes reports on visits to areas in Africa, NAME, and Europe.

Internal: Panchayat celebration involves colleagues from the city in a Julien Bream concert followed by pizza party.

Contradiction: Creating the systems to get through the Fortnight and get a new quarter launched simultaneously. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Circuits nail down participation of nine people in the Primal Community: The Next Decade Research and Training Fortnight. Guardian hosts dinner with key people in Lige Metro putting a stake in Wallania frame.

Internal: Movement event shifts visitors into colleagues at Panchayat visitation concert.

Contradiction: Accelerating awakening sets while focusing on training and formulation. (Wk. 3)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP**

External: Local colleague decides to take responsibility for Cooperative industry and helps launch the cooperative members into a new orbit of activity and responsibility. Three-hour old sojourner travels with three staff to Brussels Formation Fortnight.

Internal: Attending the Easter celebration at St. Peter's Square along with 100,000 from around the world impacts the House with the global church as the Pope gives Easter greetings in 20 languages.

Contradiction: Finding ways to turn the dial of responsibility for the mission on regional colleagues. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP**

External: Ijede's Social Commission is set-up for the first meeting. Two-month salaries paid in full to the Ijede Community Industries marks village victory. External: Visit with the Director of Technical Assistance of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs promises assistance in housing, funding, and introductions to other ministries of the Ivory Coast government.

Internal: Easter Sunday celebrates the first week in Abidjan with an on-the-beach picnic and a visit to Grand Bassam, the former colonial capital which is now a ghost town.

Contradiction: Nailing down the practices of housing and ICA office installation while needing to move to program installation. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: After two weeks of extensive circuits and phone calls 18 people from eight regions are committed for the Formation Fortnight with more than 30 still considering attending. Internal: House Church, after area council with four regional colleagues present, celebrates area prior's birthday and sends Margreet Farid out to Academy.

Contradiction: Thinking "big" when small not only seems beautiful but realistic as well. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The whole region seems to be at Formation Fortnight in Brussels with the van Eses and two no one had recruited. Documents are handed out to the 102 participants from 19 nations at the close of the Symposium on the Next Decade of Development.

Internal: House gathers for the first time in several weeks to hear stories of how the EG have been globalizing their sitters and participating in moving the Wenges to a new apartment.

Contradiction: Arranging our quarter timeline to capitalize on the momentum from Formation Fortnight. (Wk. 5)

Internal: New quarter assignments allow the new women of Egypt to claim priorship roles.

Contradiction: Seeing through the morass of tactics preceding the CEM to the miracle swirls that spin into the extension phase. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Ford Foundation okays grants for Zambia and Kenya—word from director of local Ford office: "We won!" NORAD comes through with 16,000 KES for 10 scholarships for second round and does it in less than a week. Machakos District coverage is completed as remaining two consults in villages of Kitandi and Muni-Mwanyani this week hold the seven divisions with HDPs.

Internal: All project directors participate in consults for Kitandi and Muni-Mwanyani.

Contradiction: Being the jugglers who can keep all plates spinning in every arena of replication. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell's Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers' preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Global film showing captures imagination of villagers on the movement of Those Who Care. Whitewash shramdan transforms Stake 4 into the limelight. Members of the Village Reconstruction Organization visit village and view the global film.

Internal: Three staff members and two villagers are assigned to Global Research Colloquy in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Reinvigorating village structures which seem like a glacier in their sluggishness. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: This great week moves toward financial solvency for this Zone.

Internal: Nexus holds modified Nexus Council, sends everyone out with great Chinese celebration and welcomes Ken Otto.

Contradiction: Coordinating time to self-consciously hold four Centurms with only two Centurms present. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Two incredible weeks of non-stop engagement in the first of 24 Community Extension Modules (CEMs) leaves everyone exhausted and awe-filled. History writing of village draws forth the great story tellers. First of series of Town Meetings to be held in Kuala Selangor held day before closing celebration. Module ends with speeches and presentation of plaque :the Symbol of 24. Village meets immediately after closing to elect Secretariat and new chairman urges all to work together since this is now their Project.

Internal: Entire Sungai Lui staff moves in with nexus for three days to ensure document and re-writing of procedures manual is completed.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on engagement of past two weeks in order to sustain new decisions. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Strategic Development brings in Rp 600,000 from Toyota and ITT, while NURADA swirls with activity. Rp 400,000 from Coca Cola helps to finish community center, while PVC pipers are in-kind to repair water system. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP

External: Third LENS for PTPVI and sixth for Area Singapore this year at Air Batu Estate for 49 field level executives includes 10 women. Global film first night draws most concrete proposals and tactics yet. Maneuvers introduction session at end produces three guild groups deciding to meet.

Internal: House does quarter planning and has discontinuity in Parapat, Lake Toba, North Sumatra tourist attraction—swimming in pure volcanic crater water is a great change from salt water of Bubun.

Contradiction: Documenting the human factor for international funding agency to gain futuric evaluation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP

External: Preschool restarts following rains and rice planting. Fishpond Guild leaders attend information meeting on World Bank Loan Program for 1%-interest loans now available through the People's Bank of Indonesia (BRI). Bontoa leaders gather to rethink DOOP methods.

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: CEMs are moving down the track and building momentum geared to the need of each Project.

Internal: CEMs need to be allowed to speak to our understandings of the future and reflections on Summer '80.

Contradiction: Discerning the systems that will allow corporate decisions to be made quickly and effectively over hundreds of miles. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Strategy meeting with Guardians plans steps to secure the maximum use of the village lawyer to protect its interest. Every step Nam Wai makes is potential policy for New Territories. Negotiations are touchy.

Internal: House attends farewell party for the Hall family at Suzanna's Resturant in Sai Kung.

Contradiction: Keeping the interest of the whole village before the Board so that the whole village benefits from its structure and work. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Preparation for the Big Move into new Centre is initiated. House welcomes Taipei colleagues who perform vital cleaning in preparation for final tile polish. Group of 30 Provincial Government officials visit Hai Ou.

Internal: Friday night Ecclesiola expands images of world with research on Addis Ababa. House celebrates completed life of Mae's grandfather.

Contradiction: Keeping our sight on the far horizon in the midst of the blinding light of approaching Grand Opening day. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: In-kind for HDTs includes P10,000 worth of food. Ben Aguirang attends Academy and Debbie de Vela visits projects on west coast of USA. Month closes with second largest in-hand cash total recorded.

Internal: House celebrates four day Easter holiday and is especially impacted by the emphasis on Good Friday.

Contradiction: Dealing with global issues in midst of requests for support of specific concerns. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: LENS marketing visits with 14 companies are completed. Johnson & Johnson and IBM say yes to LENS for Quarter II, 1980. Far Eastern Textile Ltd., sixth largest company in Taiwan, requests LENS "as soon as possible" to assist in building plan and consensus for energy conservation of 10% in 1980.

Internal: LENS team returns to Hong Kong after two-week trek with a schedule for June LENSes projected.

Contradiction: Finding sufficient funds to meet expenses projected by July 15 while moving simultaneously on next development orbit. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Representatives from the Philippine Business for Social Progress sit down with the HDTs faculty and staff to evaluate training programs in the midst of preparation for the fourth school. The weaving of HDTs and the 24 begins as Timex Corporation agrees to have agriculture module workday on a one-hectare high-intensity demonstration farm and to host the urban trip. The Model House Contest—one entry from every stake of every village—has received one gallon of paint each, a total of 120 houses participating.

Internal: First draft of a liturgy based on the writings of Lao Tzu is completed.

Contradiction: Balancing the need to finish the year with both a self-support surplus and a burst of direct mission. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Three Kwang Yung Il ban meetings and Guardian Advisors meeting all focus on reviewing and celebrating the documentation results.

Internal: Gale force winds blow down telephone and electricity lines encouraging candlelight collegiality.

Joe Quillian from Perkins does absolution and the celebration closes by singing *The Sign*.
