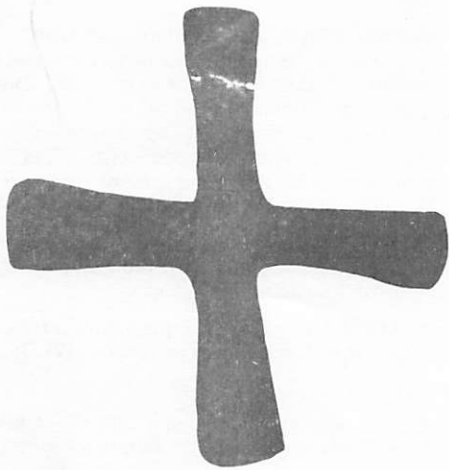

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: A fine representation at the GRA is assured as final phase of funding goes into operation.

Internal: The new house begins to take shape as roofers stop the leaking, plumbing becomes operational, broken windows are replaced and lighting installed in every room.

Contradiction: Struggling to define the external mission with a small House in the midst of establishing the new facility and all that that entails. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Follow-up meetings with colleagues in the Glasgow and Manchester Regions plan leadership training events with a local congregation in Coatbridge, Glasgow and an emerging LENS strategy in Leeds Metro, Manchester.

Internal: The House takes Saturday night to celebrate the fact that keeping the systems going with half the troops is a full time job.

Contradiction: Scheduling events for the summer quarter when most everyone seems to be on holiday. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAIRGWAITH HDP:

External: Area Youth Cluster catalyzes planning by Tairgwaith Youth Council to raise funds for community building. Phone blitz sets ten appointments with Religious Orders for week 11 in five metros.

Internal: House doubles in size temporarily with influx of youth and one EG from London during school holidays.

Contradiction: Catalyzing implementation by local groups. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Kathren Taylor visits the House on the way to the GRA. She goes by Brussels Nexus and visits U.S. Embassies.

Internal: Participation in new area House relocation demonstrates that it is possible to find House and be living in it within three weeks.

Contradiction: Maintaining a Manchester identity in midst of operating out of the London House. (Wk. 4)

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: An April contact and participation with the Area in getting the London House settled in its new facility. Conferring with colleagues Sheila Clark in Manchester Region and Bill McKaig in Glasgow moves the regions toward programme events now and in the autumn..

Internal: Stuart leaves for the GRA and the House celebrates the 4th July by calling Area Houses with best wishes for Independence Day and then a picnic outing and visit to three Glasgow Museums which ground the common heritage of the Western culture.

Contradiction: Achieving the proper nonchalance while positioning ourselves for the New Year's race. (Wk. 3)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: A one day planning session with Credit Agricole on the future of rural France has colleagues from all six regions of Area Paris represented around the table and is a grand success.

Internal: A feast of endings celebrates the Credit Agricole seminar and sends the Area out to Quarter I assignments.

Contradiction: Radicalizing the understanding of being assigned. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Documentation workshop using all the TM data is held. Internal: The House celebrates with a movie on T.V., popcorn and lemon pie while hosting colleagues.

Contradiction: Securing facility for Continental Council and the Guardians' Meeting. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: The year's vision of establishing the ICA with a strong French organization is realized with the Credit Agricole Symposium. Nine French guardians attend from throughout France.

Internal: The week is highlighted with year-end celebrations: one is in Paris with three French guardians and two potential interns, and the other in Brussels with the nexus.

Contradiction: Putting the necessary details into the quarter plan so victories can be realized. (Wk. 3)

### ROME

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TERMINE HDP

External: The village ACUTO decides to do a CYF and GWF in September. The TM movement becomes part of their local government programme. The third circuit to Sicily strengthens colleagues' understanding of ICA programmes and results in the decision to do a set in September.

Internal: The House celebrates the end of a quarter with a beach party, and an impromptu party on Friday evening celebrates four birthdays.

Contradiction: Creating a story of missional priorities for the summer that will engage colleagues and release future funds to ensure Italian participation in the GRA. (Wk. 3)

### LAGOS

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Bendel State Rubber Communities, participating in Village Meetings, hold their Assembly with proposals that hold significant implications for working with the other Federal Commodity Boards. This would require using LENS, then Village Meetings and an Assembly for an awakening network which would lead to cluster set-ups. New rubbish drums arrive in time for ITT rep from New York, touring to see the project. His closing line was "This visit has made my trip worthwhile; this project must be one of your best."

Internal: Overjoyed. House receives Oyler, Sanlola and Mukosha from Bendel State with victorious stories, Bill and Suzanne Parker for LENS from Accra circuit, joining the Lachmans who arrive from Zambia and two-year-old Lucy Mukosha who arrives with the Lachmans after a long wait for a passport.

Contradiction: Focusing action to put us in position to do the next year. (Wk. 13)

### ABIDJAN

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: A series of private sector call puts us in position for having an Ivorian colleague go with us on calls. This catalyses a significant contact in the Ivorian Chamber of Commerce.

Internal: Contact with INADES (African development organisation) leads to temporary housing with the Catholic Church.

Contradiction: Converting the support which is being generated into concrete practical action. (Wk. 1)

### FRANKFURT

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: In a week of circuiting in Area Vienna a breakthrough is made as heads of Religious Orders are visited with fall programme potential of 30 forums of training events. Meanwhile appointments are set with high level Protestant church symbolic leadership in authorization manoeuvre—12 appointments across Germany— with Bishops and Bishops' representatives. With three colleagues doing set up and three others leading, a great CYF is held in Frankfurt Region for 40 tenth class students in Catholic school.

Internal: As the study of Existence Rationality begins, (this time as a screen for understanding Germany) and an extended study of Friedman's chapter three *Four-fold Path of Radical Practice* gives us new ways of approaching our missional strategy, the City of Frankfurt clarifies their renovation plan for the house—as they maintain this historical building.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate focus on GRA recruitment as scatteredness in response to programme intensification in five regions seems to diffuse the victory actually won. (Wk. 12)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: A letter from Feldberpen set (week 12) expresses the change of mood in the village. A visit with Dieter Schmidberger to a government-sponsored Austrian seminar of almost all community development experiments—with 40 representatives of all structures present—gives the opportunity to show the global film and present a report from Kreuzberg Ost HDP. The Project leadership meets and deals seriously with the question of how to stand on their own feet.

Internal: Korean couple Rev. and Mrs. Kang Byong Huon visits the one-person house.

Contradiction: Missing corporated information exchange leads to vulnerable open ends in key programs. (Wk. 3)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The third regional participant for the GRA is confirmed. Transfers of 400 guilden (\$US200) are received into the travel fund.

Internal: The last day of school and the end of the year is celebrated with a vegetarian dinner followed by an organ and choir concert in the cathedral.

Contradiction: Holding a productive balance between summer priorities and the emerging generation adventure of the 80s. (Wk. 3)

### STOCKHOLM

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Thirty friends hold welcome back party with four hours of songfest and curry.

Internal: Hezekiah with two Nigerian and two Danish friends conquer whole exterior with whitewash. Andrew Knutsen and Ruth Landmann arrive; Ruth lands a job at International School in 17 hours.

Contradiction: Weaving together the area vision and reading the programmatic compass of the region. (Wk. 9)

### KINSHASA

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: The HDTI is cleared with 50 total participation, Sewing Industry is in operation with a high morale.

Internal: ICA's office has been transformed into an urban office. The House welcomes Muloshi's daughter Prisca on a special night celebration.

Contradiction: Developing strategy that allows new national development team to get more support from business houses. (Wk. 9)

### CAIRO

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE : CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Sheikh Ali villagers borrow Bayad well drilling equipment, they are taught how to use it by a Bayad team and strike water in one day.

Internal: Following a Week I feast celebration in Kiramet the entire staff is stranded on desert road at night by two flat tires; they are rescued quickly by teamwork and muscle power as a passing truck stops, everyone lifts the pick-up onto the large truck. All arrive safely that night!

Contradiction: Transplanting memory before the bodies relocate to new assignments. (Wk. 9)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Firestone E.A.Ltd. presents a check, representing 300,000 KShs. for Kenya Replication over the next three years, at large community gathering in Kabiro, with singing, dancing, speeches and press coverage. Chariman of Rotary International and wife visit Kabiro and Kamweleni HDP's, upon arrival form Bayad HDP, and will recommend Rotary support, ICA village development projects. Development reports income of 230,000 KShs. for a phenomenal month of July record.

Internal: Christopher Foya returns from Chicago and gives a report of the GRA at Collegium; George and Virginia Black celebrate 27th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Objectifying plans and assignments for August that are clear enough for anyone to carry out. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell Community Health Caretaker from Stake 4 registers 150 mothers on Clinic Day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenyan Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmers preparation at farms, troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI facility. (Wk. 8)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five, 5-day modules in district projects this quarter, creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Major breaklooses occur in funding and authorization with tax exemption (100%) given for 50 villages and the block. Development raises 26,750 rupees across the continent this week plus 6,000 rupees in in-kind goods for GRC. Vaviharsh Second Consult document is produced and first continental newsletter is completed.

Internal: GRC preparation is in full swing as international faculty arrives.

Contradiction: Building realistic strategies that will release new time, energy, and money. (Wk. 1)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Impact thrust is initiated in Area Delhi as the first LENS is held with National Small Industries Corporation (Government of India). Global Film Shows are held at Australian High Commission and United Nations Office with UNDP, UNFPA and UNWFP. Actuation continues in Sikror as village finally decides to have electricity and collects deposits from 61 families.

Internal: Delhi office turned into Wayside Inn as LENS team arrives and quick circuit by Development Centrum provides perfect excuse for impromptu House celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring that any action is done at the critical place and time for greatest effectivity. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Village moves to turn itself green with 300 trees planted, Bouganvilleas for the chowdy, and 30 private gardens. A third evening literacy class starts bringing total enrollment to 120. The literacy rate nears 40% (in 1977 it was 5%).

Internal: Twenty members of M. Mallaiah's literacy class go with auxiliary members to the circus.

Contradiction: Letting self-support commitments blind other missional possibilities. (Wk. 9)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Training the National Adult Education Programme Staff of the Government through the XISS puts us into a new arena of possibilities of training. Two students who have participated in a CYF and an Imaginal Education program visit the house requesting further work and contact.

Internal: There is a full table for the weekly ritual.

Contradiction: Creating the offensive tactics that build momentum to carry the quarter in framing and operations. (Wk. 9)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Another 100% program month! More than 25 people are sent off to the GRA. LENS calling continues to be successful.

Internal: The self-support push continues in preparation for the coming year and management charts the year (onward and upward!) and holds an end of quarter celebration.

Contradiction: Establishing the systems which care for the zone through the GPC. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SERUSUP-HDP

External: Seven months after strategically relocating the ICA auxiliary outside the village, another report is received from the villagers. Recent victories include: legal incorporation of the LEV, 40 full time employees in the handicraft industry and 17 full time employees in the village fish farm. The fish farm production has doubled, produce sold for \$18,000(US) and 900 chicken layers have begun producing. The fishing co-op has ordered its first deep sea trawler and the Serusup leaders have visited other villages to train and help them set up their own LEV.

Internal: Dixie Jennings-Teats is sent to Chicago to assist in GRA preparation.

Contradiction: Maintaining relations between Serusup and the Global Movement over great distances. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SUNGAI LUI HDP**

External: Pilot MTM (Community Forum) training event is hosted by the Kuala Selangor District Office with 12 representing the four MTM villages. This includes all the headmen and a school principal and three of the District Officer's representatives. Ford lends the project a 1980 *Fiesta* for the duration of the MTM campaign.

Internal: Rochmat returns from CEM in Kelapa Dua and the entire House takes on the task of getting the ICA Malaysia into the mail.

Contradiction: Creating the model that will allow the MTM campaign to be done by those business and local people already possessing leadership responsibilities. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Global Film shown to Indian Community and to a new Indonesian Foundation set up to relate to the business community to development in Indonesia. Training session with Mirada Economic Commission readies them to host a site visit for local textile company interested in hiring a team of people from Mirada to work at the factory.

Internal: The Wests begin new self-support area consultation assignment with a 10 day LENS evaluation in North Sumatra. Mrs. Arifin, Indonesian guardian, returns from GRA-80 in time to join Wests in North Sumatra.

Contradiction: Deciding the effective action which engages all troops in midst of missional lull, post GRA-GPC expectations and national post-fasting celebration. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN-BUBUN HDP**

External: The cluster health program begins with Health Caretaker recruitment in six villages, a survey is begun in Bubun, and a workday launches Bubun electrification. *Cluster News* is distributed. Legislature members from a neighboring Province visit Bubun.

Internal: Troops are sent to Jakarta for Area Council while the House celebrates the life and death of an auxiliary member's brother.

Contradiction: Waiting on the Area Council to decide the next moves. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG-BONTOA HDP**

External: Thirty-five Town Meetings completed! — 17 done in eight days covering three counties. The last six are up in the mountains, requiring an overnight stay for the 26 teachers. The reconstructing of the Mosque begins with the arrival of the first two loads of sand.

Internal: The Global Fast Day is a religious experience, as Muslims and Christians participate in a common ritual, and see their unity of purpose as they participate together in the Act of Poverty.

Contradiction: Revealing victories which are still in disguise as immediate victories hide long range plan. (Wk. 9)

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Stipends go out on time for Area Tokyo.

Internal: Edward returns from Manila with new stories, and is sent to Nam Wai for "welcome home" pizza.

Contradiction: Establishing structures that care for people who have conflicting schedules. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP**

External: Village board has second meeting with Gammons (co-developer of Mautin) and sets date for regular monthly Board meetings. Annual village Sports Day is held with over 60 participants in different competitions.

Internal: Margaret Topple is HKIS faculty, spends Week II in village.

Contradiction: Determining the forward directions in the midst of staff transition. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP**

External: Great excitement in Tai-Yuen and Hai Ou as solid possibilities emerge for the Home Factory sub-contracts. Kaohsiung Fish Processing Company confirms self-support position for next year at \$500/month.

Internal: House welcomes Anne Townley for two days and sends out summer sojourner with great party celebration of singing, eating, dancing and charades in that order.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum of past weeks with only auxiliary on site. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Visits with Philippine government officials, foreign embassies, and target corporations reaffirm support of ICA program for next year. Intensive follow-up on committed and working money from past development trek is continued, and telephoning blitz for next trek is begun. Philippine regions PSU on expansion of ICA bookkeeping system is held following the annual audit.

Internal: House hosts parish and school friends of Heather Howell in despedida party as she leaves for the US and student house and the movie *Kramer vs Kramer* addresses house as great image builder relative to responsibility.

Contradiction: Covering all the bases to enable finishing the year in the black and providing base for launching next year. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: A request for assistance with cottage industry program in the villages of Fang Liao township (surrounding Hai Ou) are printed in Chinese and ready for mailing to colleagues and local companies. The staff enlistment process is redesigned, including new application form, P.O. Box number, introduction letter, newspaper advertisement, and one page summary of the Hai Ou Project and ICA work. Twelve companies are contacted with regard to finding cottage industry possibilities.

Internal: June House finances are pulled together through the completion of the month's ledgers and the summer internal models are done.

Contradiction: Testing and establishing an objective, continuous process of enlisting new staff to support extensive program and development thrusts in Chinese society during the next four years. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Village cooking demonstrations through trained village Health Nutrition workers, coordinated by the Ministry of Education and the community, kicks off the first week of July, allowing Mactan Island to radically participate in this national nutrition month. National Ministry members are so impressed that they take movies of cooking demonstration and send films to the First Lady. Sudtonggan's second elementary school building is finished.

Internal: Ben Aguirang arrives from the academy just two days before his wife, Victoria, gives birth to Benjamin Aguirang Jr., and Lester Knutsen arrives for a three day consult with the House as part of his circuiting between Manila, Cebu and Davao.

Contradiction: Enabling government agencies to unite in the Nutrition Fair. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: The Ministry of Social Services and Development provides lots of food for the eight Mountain Cluster preschools. A second group of doctors from Brokenshire Hospital arrives for a month's stay in Langub. Magruod HDP General Stores hold an inventory and declares a profit, and Lumun HDP plants a community demonstration farm.

Internal: The house gets a new burner to cook on, new locks for the doors and has a workday for beautification.

Contradiction: Maintaining preschool attendance in the midst of the rainy season. (Wk. 4)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Guardians Paul Murayama and George Kawai travel to Fukioka to teach LENS. Kawai translates all five passages from *The Ronin* into Japanese and is overwhelmed by the positive response.

Internal: Christina's 12 year old niece travels alone from California to Tokyo for a two-week visit, and is grandly hosted by the House and Japanese colleagues.

Contradiction: Allowing the scattered nature of July to intensify the local mission by requiring new leadership from local colleagues. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Twenty consultants and Guardians visit in preparation for CEM, as village bar campaign moves into final stretch of five bars.

Internal: Jeni is sent out to Seoul Region Management meeting in Seoul House.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the mythic foundations of Jeju Island for the sake of rapid and effective extension. (Wk. 7)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The House celebrates the conclusion of one month sojourn training program that includes the Voyage, RS1, RS111a and CS111a. Two of the sojourners stay on to spend the month of July in Kuh Du E Ri expansion work. Development and inkind continue to bubble with quarterly donations and medicine for expansion villages Health Outposts.

Internal: Seoul House continues to be full to capacity as sojourners are replaced with hosting Japan colleagues and the Armas family on reroute to Chicago. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Three villagers from Cho Yang Expansion village visit Seoul. They check on material and machinery for a rice bag industry they hope to begin in the very near future.

Internal: A chicken barbeque on the mountainside overlooking Kuh Duh E Ri orives to bethe perfect spot to have a send-out celebration for the Armas family.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum high as tactics become harder to do. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Auditor's meeting is held. Excitement builds in brooding over Fall plans.

Internal: House sees *Miracle Worker* as celebration, and is impacted by the demonstration of care for children in that film.

Contradiction: Allowing the broodings of all arenas to inform the planning ahead. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Eighteen ICA volunteers attend the International Women's Meeting for Osaka City Fujinkai Organization and UNESCO. A circuit team makes a TM presentation for Tokushima prefecture government and follows up the Nara prefecture presentation with visits to local government offices. A Guardians' Meeting invitation is sent to the wrong person and gets a yes response.

Contradiction: Bringing into focus the emphasis of the summer by naming the major thrust. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO—OYUBARI HDP

External: Final arrangements for the YMCA camp are made with the city office. TM documentation is completed and sent to Urakawa and the CEM document translation continues. Thank you letters are sent to social education directors visited on *Hokkaido 10* circuit.

Internal: The House goes swimming at Shimizusawa, Naomi and Yu Sato participate with many community residents in the Kindergarten sports day, House staff including children participate in English classes in Takikawa and Roger and Mr and Mrs Kirata are sent out to the GRA.

Contradiction: Finding corporate time to accomplish what is needed with the House in two places. (Wk. 3)

## SYDNEY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The best production to date of *Have-a-Go Gazette*, printed on gold paper, tells stories of winning community programmes in six towns. It is mailed to 550 regional contacts. Twenty Mother superiours respond with delightful colleagueality to a showing of the Global Film and immediately set a second showing for July 20th.

Internal: July 4th is celebrated with an evening indoor picnic with hot dogs, chips, apple pie and cream and toasted marshmallows over the open fire; Dianne Oakley sojourns and joins the House in late nights of tennis to see aboriginal Evonne Goolagon-Cawley win at Wimbledon.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional intentionality in the midst of a relaxed winter style. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: *The Have-a-Go Gazette* is finally off the press and ready to post. Reports continue to come in on follow-up to Community Meeting and Economic Community Forum proposals.

Internal: Word from Chicago of an exciting - Global Priors Council gets House excited in turn.

Contradiction: Building timelines and strengthening spirit disciplines to release more solid missional focus. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: House and Regional colleagues gather for "mid-quarter course correction" workshop on Week II which identifies need for new directions and strategies working within the quarter's maneuvers.

Internal: Man who answered article in Anglican magazine about "monk for a month" in Murrin Bridge, arranges to go for a month and attends ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Celebrating past engagement to release shift to new vision of the future. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: East Preston core group meets to grid the parish and to state the vision. 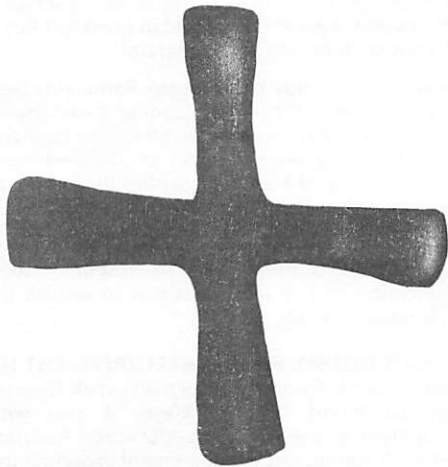

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Key framing/authorization call with national woman MP leads to entre into state government Chief Minister and Chief Secretary and a yes to year long visas for non-commonwealth troops. In midst of council preparation as teams sent to Maliwada for set up; inkind casts its net in Bombay; Rs 30,000 (\$4,000) comes in from VST; and preparation begins on ILO Survey on training possibilities for village women.

Internal: Cock and Berresford families, John Burbridge, Paula Philbrook, Mangla Talokar arrive in time for precouncil comprehensive strategic brooding with nexus and areas.

Contradiction: Welding the common images together that release troops to take leap in the dark, in relationship to new edges and priorities for the year. (Wk. 12)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI-SIKROR HDP

External: Impact thrust is initiated in Area Delhi as the first LENS is held with National Small Industries Corporation (Government of India). Global film shows are held at Australian High Commission and United Nations Office with UNDP, UNFPA and UNWFP. Actuation continues in Sikror as village finally decides to have electricity and collects deposits from 61 families.

Internal: Delhi office turned into Wayside Inn as LENS team arrives and quick circuit by Development Centrum provides perfect excuse for impromptu House celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring that any action is done at the critical place and time for greatest effectivity. (Wk. 9)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Women's association is awarded a government subsidy for 21 dairy buffaloes and cows, sheep and chicken loans and a rice mill. Fourteen farmers receive hybrid fodder grass and fertilizer and a village-wide expansion into the dairy business is off the ground. A teacher from a nearby wool cooperative arrives to do three weeks training of weavers.

Internal: Four auxiliary are sent out to continental council.

Contradiction: Sharing of S'80 products in simple language without childlike oversimplification. (Wk. 11)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First Bengali school Community Youth Forum set up for September. This opens up imagination for doing events in local languages.

Internal: New assignments force patterns of new responsibility.

Contradiction: Discerning the weeks miracle that pushes boldly into offensive tactics in the midst of the four week troop change period. (Wk. 10)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Another 100% program month! More than 25 people are sent off to the GRA. LENS calling continues to be successful.

Internal: The self-support push continues in preparation for the coming year and management charts the year (onward and upward!) and holds an end of quarter celebration.

Contradiction: Establishing the systems which care for the zone through the GPC. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CFBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**

External: Mactan 24 nutrition workers follow up for graduation and check up snacks. New priors in Cebu House visit in South and West Division. Winthrop Sterling delivers medicine in Sudtonggan clinic. Dr. Amores from city's health office and Joan Chipkin visit for the summary of preschool weight.

Internal: The House send out Lester Knutsen and Steve Lenhouts to Manila for the preparation of the coming area council.

Contradiction: Enabling the 24 ECNC teachers work for monthly weights and provide new stacks of CSM. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: The Ministry of Social Services and Development provides lots of food for the eight Mountain Cluster preschools. A second group of doctors from Brokenshire Hospital arrives for a month's stay in Langub. Magruod HDP General Stores hold an inventory and declares a profit, and Lumun HDP plats a community demonstration farm.

Internal: The house gets a new burner to cook on, new locks for the doors and has a workday for beautification.

Contradiction: Maintaining preschool attendance in the midst of the rainy season. (Wk. 4)

External: Guardians Paul Murayama and George Kawai travel to Fukuoka to teach LENS. Kawai translates all five passages from *The Ronin* into Japanese and is overwhelmed by the positive response.

Internal: Christina's 12 year old niece travels alone from California to Tokyo for a two-week visit, and is grandly hosted by the House and Japanese colleagues.

Contradiction: Allowing the scattered nature of July to intensify the local mission by requiring new leadership from local colleagues. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**

External: Twenty consultants and Guardians visit in preparation for CEM, as village bar campaign moves into final stretch of five bars.

Internal: Jeni is sent out to Seoul Region Management meeting in Seoul House.

Contradiction: Breaking loose the mythic foundations of Jeju Island for the sake of rapid and effective extension. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Recreating the Global Language School curriculum and recruiting two, one-week residential immersion English courses keep the House in a real spin. A great awakening event results with possibilities for engagement of the 18 participants firmly established when the first school returns as a total group during the second school to learn more about ICA. 100,000 won is developed from the church and circuit monitoring trip to KDER and three of the extension villages shows that all programs are in good shape.

Contradiction: Building a creative comprehensive screen that allows us to see all the demands that are before us so that nothing slips through the holes. (Wk. 12)

External: Decision to enable local leadership to do the task is signaled by Mill Shoals core training toward CEM, Annual Appeal coordination by regional guides and Imaginal Education Workshop with Catholic lay teachers led by metro colleagues.

Internal: Move to operating as a regional team is actualized in sending Mark Harvey to Mill Shoals, Jeff Clithero in advance of family to Brussels and marathon planning weekend.

Contradiction: Putting the spring in the springboard of regional council and the Annual Appeal to objectify and deepen regional team commitment. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP**

External: The first four of five stake meetings are held to draw sketches for a 20-year space management plan. Up-to-date information on small diameter sewer system is distributed.

Internal: A special ecclesiola celebrates the birthdays of two house members.

Contradiction: Engaging troops in a single thrust. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY—KINNEY HDP**

External: Kinney Custom Industries holds an Economic Forum and puts the company down the road. KCI partner does battle-planning with her family, and runs over to tell us, "the method works!"

Internal: Addie Lyman is sent to Chicago for summer preparation. Barbara and the EG travel to graduation ceremony, leaving Mike and Joe to prepare the House sale.

Contradiction: Enabling the community to recognize fully the implications of transition. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

External: Planning for youth of Green Bay begins at a meeting with two regional colleagues and a director of youth programs.

Internal: The House expands the Wayside Inn dynamic with guests from Brillion, LaCrosse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, Chicago, Berkeley and San Francisco.

Contradiction: Expanding the House's catalytic role in the region. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Youth Fair in local neighborhood YMCA wins follow-up call from the YMCA asking for ways to work together in more events.

Internal: Metro Cadre colleagues stage send out for the Bengels and a welcome for the Gibsons, the youth cluster start school, and the Vice President of the signal neighborhood Board invites the House out to a gourmet dinner to launch the fall season.

Contradiction: Creating the paradigm of the movemental order as the principle actor in the drama of human development. (Wk. 11)

Internal: Richard Stanley arrives for Annual Appeal kick-off, Lois Martin moves in for 10-week sojourn during her student teaching assignment from MSU and Laura Early demonstrates an exemplary style of hurdling her "no" as she starts her first week of school—all dramatizing the launching of The Year of the Region.

Contradiction: Marshaling the incomplete support systems that are diffusing missional focus. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Monthly *Breakloose* distributed amidst major efforts being mounted and enabled in Central and Collinwood neighborhoods.

Internal: Arrival of Marilyn Ann, Born August 13, to Katherine Fenton, enlivens House dramatically as four generations of Smiths celebrate homecoming.

Contradiction: Shifting from the local to the Regional. (Wk. 10)

**NEW YORK**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Symposium dynamic in area council provides a backdrop that allows for concrete directions to be formed for this next year. Guest speakers are Barbara Hubbard from the Committee on the Future and Jeremy Rifin, author of *Entropy*. Patterson and Newark Metros meet to reflect on forums and meetings held this summer and consider implications for this year.

Internal: All troops are in the House on August 24 as House welcome a family from Amsterdam.

Contradiction: Doing the year's work of formulating six metros before Thanksgiving. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Widen HDP core looks to the future and invents ingenious methods to build consensus. Huntington Metro Core takes up Guardian roles and development.

Internal: Charleston Outpost relocates, double the space, 500% more windows and only \$15 a month more.

Contradiction: Reframing after coal company management shake-up and potential political shifts in county. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP**

External: Favorable review of last year's VISTA project finally completed. Glen McGee participate in great trip to Washington D.C. and Ivy City for Congressional calls.

Internal: House takes Jean and Stew Stowell to dinner at Lakeside Inn and attends a hilarious local musical revue.

Contradiction: Precipitating a corporate focus on the transition events. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

External: Collins Common colleague volunteers to take over Hartford House lease and become "the Hartford Metro

Outpost" Asylum Hill Congregational Church minister asks for a series of presentations on Village Adoption.

Internal: A week of "coming and going" as Anne returns, Yallops visit enroute to Hong Kong, Doug goes to New York for visa work, Laura goes to Chicago, and Susanna moves in.

Contradiction: Clarifying the transition story that will release the engagement of strong Metro colleagues, ensuring links to Boston and the globe. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Mary Coggeshall shows India and Sudtonggan slides to Albany Metro guardian colleagues. Three of the audience plan to attend the symposium in Chicago.

Internal: The House celebrates three wedding anniversaries on one week, two years for the Lindstroms, seven years for the Emericks, 21 years for the Roses.

Contradiction: Moving slowly on things that can get done quickly. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Colleagues from three metros and House gather in two different metros on Saturday in order to work out the practices of our ASA prep.

Internal: A new relationship between the symbolic and extended order impacts the house on Saturday workday.

Contradiction: Telling the on-target story that will release callers and potential pledgers during the ASA. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP**

External: Five plus two from community core drive the auxiliary to the Global Symposium and one plus two remain for the GRA. Trips back to 1977 forum locations in New

Brunswick and Gaspé reveal an interest in where the movement is today and provides guidelines for future follow-up.

Internal: Leisure summer with one provides ample time for catch-up study and self-support advancement.

Contradiction: Allowing questions blocks preparation for the new year. (Wk. 10)

## CARACAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Global film showing in three cluster villages followed by area council in Caracas visioning regional coverage gets the year in gear.

Internal: John, Helen and Elaine are sent out and Hur Myung Hee, Jody Booher and Diane Jewell are welcomed.

Contradiction: Creating the structure and question to allow the decision of four cluster villages. (Wk. 12)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Intense focus completes Miserior proposal for marketing agency in time for framing maneuvers. Social programs are strengthened by eight government salaries. Nutrition team and sector teams are launched.

Internal: Ecclesiola reflection reveals wisdom gained in the year and models to share with the world. House children care for 200 rabbits.

Contradiction: Creating a weekly rhythm with the community's administrative team which includes the needed dynamics of training and consensus formation. (Wk. 9)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: A trip to the regional medical structures in Macae reveals an openness towards getting a visiting community nurse into the community. More guinea pigs arrive; existing guinea pigs flourish as the July sale approaches, street names are chosen and signs painted, naming the historical heroes of Bananeiras. Money comes in, \$1,000 from ITT and \$700 from Nutricia to tide us over the summer.

Internal: The community arrives on our doorstep to say goodbye to Ruth and Alicia after a year in the village and Eneide, Brazilian Academy grad arrives to sojourn in Bananeiros and guns the children's after-school program.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to claim recent victories as their victories. (Wk. 4)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Preschool reopens for year with 28 children and PTA meets to complete registration forms which are delivered next day for submission. Cooperative office equipment is secured with IADB grant monies. Kingston Region frame and guardian appointments are scheduled and global film showing to young adult Catholic discussion group results in people signing up for regional council and engagement opportunities.

Internal: September plan is created and Kerous are sent out while Humphrey Nyapuodi arrives.

Contradiction: Implementing key practical models for month of September. (Wk. 12)

## MEXICO CITY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: With the help of the doctor in resident for two months, the Health Caretakers hold raffle and open first laboratory in the clinic.

Internal: Heavy assignments in development leave the auxiliary with two members for the major part of the week thereby encouraging more community participation in internal structures.

Contradiction: Assuring effective use of time while acing out of the configuration of a "mini-auxiliary". (Wk. 9)

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SANVINCENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: Four community people tell the story of Azpitia's achievements to 60 of Frank and Ruth Archibald's friends at the showing of the global film. Saturdays continue to be eventful as Services Guild workday on the road is interrupted by a visit from Luis Paz family and friends followed by a visit by Mrs. Suero (donor) and friend who leave with Jesus (invalid), who under their sponsorship, will be staying in a rehabilitation house for a few months.

Internal: Tim Hahn and Rene Castle, teenagers from Sacramento, are sent out after a month of significant engagement including digging and cementing the house septic tank which is now complete.

Contradiction: Doing the dos which require regularity in a time of great change. (Wk. 10)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports \$257,464 US is pledged by Tuesday noon of the first week of the \$1.2 million North American Annual Appeal. Phoenix Region leads the way with 100 visits set. Resettlement money-raising efforts nets \$63,869 thus far. Well used telex between Singapore, Hong Kong and Chicago signals increased flow of data within the Centrum Band. The key contradiction is holding the tension between securing in-hand money and establishing ongoing area and regional systems.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports pilot Round Table was held in Hong Kong Nexus as well as launching Emerging Generation curriculum. World Bank assignee to India visits Chicago for 2 days of context as preparation for a research project on methods for caring for the poorest of the poor. Both Round Table for Quarter II and Internal Life Guide for the year are ready to go to press. The newly organized and functioning archives were celebrated by the Nexus. Two collegiums on PSU net initiate consensus to do 3 all-Nexus PSU's a quarter in Chicago followed by a PSU in each house of North America each quarter; The first three are ballooned as Regional Consult, Order Forms and LENS Pedagogy. Also Day II troops have done the Internal Life Guide as a new 100% engagement mode. Key contradiction: Nexus space orchestrating is critical to being exemplary Religious House but currently delayed until Week 1, Quarter II.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports problem solving unit and collegium on Regional Consult reveals possibility of this event catapulting any region into a new orbit of human development. Nairobi picks up staffing LENS in Egypt and Africa. The contradiction is, assuming that we would win on all fronts, the vague bottom lines in all areas except the Academy create a strain on troop priorities.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that the travel desk sends out thirty six people from Chicago across North America for the Annual Appeal. House and area management forms and procedures are prepared and sent with the centrum to Hong Kong Area Council. Seeing care for the International Training Center budding as an investment in our missional future was occasioned by a centrum conversation and nexus collegium on building care. The key contradiction is finishing up the past year's books while forming new patterns of operation and maneuvers of action that allow us to deal creatively with our future tasks as related to the reality of our fiscal situation.
