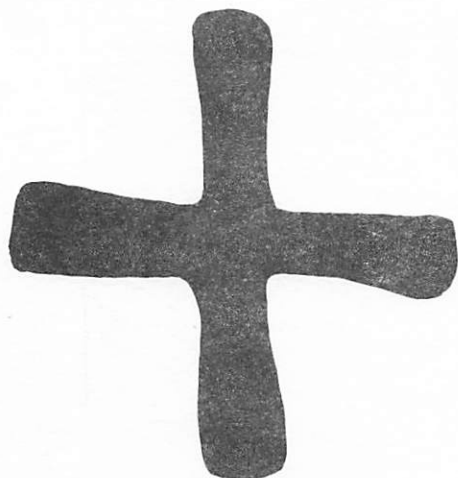

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: All systems accelerate for Regional Consult. Highlights are a host committee meeting, eight calls on religious orders, two prospects from different metros calling up and asking to register, Bishop Imesta sending key names from Vallecas, Madrid's poorest section, and the Ministry of Culture providing lists of prospects for four metros, and three colleagues volunteering for visits and set up. Local team doing follow up of Lamego set sends word that all villages are working on projects, from greenhouses and irrigation to calf pens and an agricultural association.

Internal: Development Centrum arrives from Brussels.

Contradiction: Finding the whistle point to get 40 full-paying participants around the table. (Wk. 11)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Mary Quinn (volunteer grad) returns from two-week sojourn in Brussels House before departing for India. Preparations continue for Fortnight (Brussels) and Regional Consult recruitment.

Internal: London House drives van to Bristol, meeting with Tai'rgwaith staff, and descends upon Peggy Lindsay's newly "willed" house to engage in furniture removal and storage blitz — resulting in a new living room set for London.

Contradiction: Creating an imaginal picture that rehearses key wins, gives distance on immediate paralysis and releases House to corporate action. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional Consult is an outstanding success; a Symposium of 26 participants is led by regional colleagues and held in a fine hotel. Practicum visits are hosted by six metro families and many new contacts and program possibilities are uncovered. Concrete victories include one confirmed participant in Formation Fortnight, 12 reams of paper and 500

envelopes inkinded, development commitments, one Youth Forum, and a film show. Regional Assembly at the House creates winning story and strategies for the next six months.

Internal: Michael Shaw beats 26 people to a travel management executive job for self-support victory; and an evening visit to downtown theater showing *Ordinary People* gives a slice of life for Assembly and reminds all of the perpetual task.

Contradiction: Allowing the many great colleagues of the Glasgow Region to claim the overwhelming options of engagement. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Cardiff circuit continues facility search. Format is created for regional newsletter. Sheila Hickey returns from Glasgow Regional Consult with glowing reports.

Internal: Quarter evaluation provides platform from which to send Eugene Hunter to Brussels for Formation Fortnight preparation, and Welsh liturgy is created as part of global experiment.

Contradiction: Solving today's problems today while preparing to tackle tomorrow's problems tomorrow. (Wk. 13)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Week 10 Europe Continent Area Priors check-signals meeting turns out to be amazingly easy to do.

Internal: Week 11 conversations on GRA '81 holds unity in the midst of diverse tasks.

Contradiction: Building the model that utilizes all resources to get a lot done and have fun. (Wk. 11)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: All three rings of the circus are in full swing — film and speaking events in Eastern Belgium, preparations for NGO

permeation, job conversations with top officials of General Motors and International Harvester. India guest night nets volunteers to clean Fortnight facility from EEC.

Internal: House receives Mary Quinn, volunteer from Britain for four-six weeks, who begins to bring some order to the order.

Contradiction: Creating decor that symbolizes intent of victorious fortnight recruitment. (Wk. 11)

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Ten-week focus on Regional Consult culminates in the opening event — the Symposium — as 28 colleagues attend with the leadership of all sessions in the hands of the movement. Inkind victories surprise staff with their ease and quickness. First contact with groups dealing with foreign residents of Frankfurt result in interest in future cooperation.

Internal: House fills up as numbers swell to 25 over the weekend and Symposium celebration Saturday night maintains a local tradition with a keg (of inkind beer) opening ceremony, fine buffet, music and conversation — master of ceremonies is movement colleague.

Contradiction: Deepening and broadening relationship with colleagues who have been interested but unfocused and unengaged. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Visit with the managing director of AM International invites first solid LENS proposal plus a proposal for inkind printing. House hosts a guest night with seven guests, one Dutchman and six Vietnamese settlers, and one more person says yes to attending the Urban Challenge Fortnight. A woman calling from Lutton says, "The ICA was recommended by a government worker near here. . . Could you come and help me wake up my village?"

Internal: A Week II of discontinuous activity begins with a celebration with Development Centrum troops which includes a visit to the site where Tom Reemstma is remodeling a house boat, and the next day the House and Nexus complete a washing machine exchange maneuver, moving an inkind washer from Holland to Brussels and a machine from Brussels to Holland.

Contradiction: Finding the key to engaging local passion in effective local community when the best story is working in countries of the Southern Sphere. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Regional team sends two to Frankfurt in preparation for Regional Consult. Calls are made on local government to print document.

Internal: Ismael returns from Turkey having successfully completed final university exams, and Amal gets a job to push self-support closer to an end-of-the-year victory.

Contradiction: Maintaining a revolutionary stance while working with established structures grounded again by company's two-year timeline bumping against staff's two-month one. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

## STOCKHOLM

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: A week's work with W.H.O. (World Health Organization) Copenhagen reveals new contacts in many fields across Europe in eastern as well as western block countries. It turns out that W.H.O. librarian lives near the House and is active in local community, and she opens her house to ICA staff for further introductions to W.H.O. personnel over dinners.

Internal: House sends Banks to Brussels for continental council and then on to Regional Consult in Frankfurt, and Andrew Knutsen is sent from Paris Regional Consult to Glasgow Regional Consult via Brussels Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Tying down interested but uncommitted possible participants for the Brussels Formation Fortnight. (Wk. 11)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: El Alalma diesel arrives, 90% of squash seeenee seeds sprout in desert reclamation farm, and play equipment is erected in community center playground. Danish Church Aid representative tours Bayad and recommends US\$10,000 request. Women's health and literacy classes are initiated in three villages as Quarter IV opens in high gear.

Internal: New Roundtable construct proves workable in third world situation.

Contradiction: Clarifying tactics to confirm quickly key authorization affirmation of Raee four-year plan initiation. (Wk. 1)\*

## ABIDJAN

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Endorsement of LENS by the Deputy General Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce and the Ivory Coast School for Corporation Directors provides a realistic LENS marketing strategy. A "Month of Human Development" construct including the Regional Consult, a two-week training design and village development cluster initiation is created.

Internal: The regional team is expanded as Ivoirian sociologist comes daily to work with the ICA.

Contradiction: Enlarging the space to correspond with missional task. (Wk. 11)\*

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Over 100 attend the HDTS opening feast, including 51 participants from ten villages; and Mrs. Mavis Muyunda, Member of Parliament (M.P.) for Katuba Constituency, gives opening address. Touring Bata Shoe Company and conducting village forums highlight the first two weeks. The HDTS is officially opened and the Kayosha Primary School (KHDP) is dedicated on March 1st by the Honourable Mr. Kasuto, Member of the Central Committee for Central Province, the District Governor for Kabue Rural and the M.P. The six-hour event was set up by the M.P. with many guests of public, private and local sectors present. KHDP hosted the day with a site tour and lunch, covered by the two largest Zambia newspapers.

Internal: Pulling off a full-time practics and development unit and making EG a rotating faculty assignment begin to lend focus to the overwhelming task of sustaining HDTS; ongoing development, inkind and authorization feel strangely like "internal" tasks.

Contradiction: Finding the symbol that will call forth and firmly establish the 12 expansion villages before the consults begin next Wednesday. (Wk. 10)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Cluster consult team tri-locates across Kenya to prepare for Week 13 consults. Three development teams go to cluster sites to intensify cluster coalition cadre work. Rest of House prepares to join consults, pulling out all stops on cluster replicability.

Internal: David Coffman and Sandra Rafos are sent out to Zambia for LENS; and inkind victories include painting and flooring of EG space and a major inkind food source asking for privilege of funding programs.

Contradiction: Moving beyond obscure back-up strategy for next three weeks and for launching Quarter IV. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: In the midst of going a million miles an hour on Bombay Regional Consult preparation with PR pieces, development, and training PSU, staff stops for a continental check-signals meeting and consensus on continental timeline for next few months.

Internal: Four village leaders from Maliwada arrive at the Nexus on their way to the Bombay Regional Consult, R. Jagdhani prepares for the Delhi Regional Consult — they are a sign of the new role Maliwada is playing in Phase III. Vittu Meshram is gravely ill in the hospital. Heidi Holmes is set out as faculty in Global Academy.

Contradiction: Naming the bottom line victories for each area calls forth the necessity for comprehensive centrum presence in the regional Assemblies. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Gram Sabhas (community forums) are held in last two cluster villages and maneuver culminates in a Cluster Assembly which is also attended by BDO (Block Development Officers) and district officials. Women's meeting in Sikror decides to start a sewing cooperative to manufacture factory uniforms; two machines are inkinded and four factories give tentative orders. INALSA, UNICEF, Family Planning Foundation, Abner School, Dutch Embassy, MODI's, a Minneapolis guardian, Mary D'Souza and Faith Vance from Brussels all visit Sikror in a ten-day period.

Internal: House welcomes the Prakash family to their new assignment in Delhi. Inkind typewriter, TV and two motorbikes arrive, and a free taxi is put at our disposal; the old Delhi office is given a facelift with fresh paint inside and out.

Contradiction: Deciding how much to commit staff to in the cluster and how much to leave open to openings of the Regional Consult. (Wk. 11)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Three more Gram Sabhas (community forums) near Nadlapur bring the total to 13. Twenty-two women's loan applications are completed. Village leaders decide to limit television use to one night a week to avoid interference with night classes.

Internal: Heidi is sent out to the Global Academy, Chicago, and Rachael goes with her. During Holi celebration, the auxiliary is covered with ink, sunir paint, mud, oil, soap and saffron, is doused with water, goes to a movie and swims in Lake Nizamsagar.

Contradiction: Continuing struggle by village and auxiliary with methods of delegating responsibility. (Wk. 12)\*

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Regional Consult gains momentum with first steering committee meeting and first yes to host committee. Metal Box LENS is completed, and Bata India requests one more LENS as soon as possible with Marketing Division.

Internal: House sends Michael Arulswamy to Bombay Regional Consult, Duncan Holmes returns to Hyderabad after LENS, B. Kumar, a regional colleague, visits while attending steering committee meeting, and Nexus troops arrive to set up Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Focussing practical images of momentum as six-week countdown for Regional Consult begins. (Wk. 11)\*

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Socio-Economic Planning Unit of Prime Minister's Department offers introduction to Chief Secretary of State, commits branch offices to assist in Regional Consult Practicum and plans to provide Malay-speaking workshop leaders. Routine call on computer firm turns up a passionate "hunter-warrior" engaged in innovative public-private co-venture in rural development — a perfect panelist for the Symposium. First Sungai Lui resident participates in Symposium workshop leaders training.

Internal: Jill's birthday is celebrated on March 17 with a unique cottage cheese birthday cake.

Contradiction: Relating corporate thinking-through of strategies to key Regional Consult issues. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Week of structural impact whirls as GET leadership administers purchases with remaining gift from Australian Ambassador for typewriters and sewing machines for the six cluster villages; and new strategies for local industry result in local co-op visit, handicraft training program and initial brooding on a small industry LENS. Visit of USAID auditor plus two who review grant is received with style of telling story of possibility by Bubun Cluster leadership. Indra Utama wants LENS for IMANTA Group ("King Kong"/Imral Nasution's companies) in May or June.

Internal: Yertle the Turtle makes exciting comeback at Roundtable, and Saturday night "Pirate's Cove Restaurant" transforms time and collegium room space once more. Dixie is sent to Jakarta for Pertamina LENS.

Contradiction: Spreading the hope beyond hope to the village leaders and government officials while discovering the next step in the Kecamatan Demonstration. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: LENS with Pertamina (National Oil Company), focusing on how the public relations department can launch a program to demonstrate effective human development, signals openings for further consultation with upper level management. Visit with the Director General of the Department of Social Affairs assures DEPSOS sponsorship of the Regional Consult. All four members of the Mobil consultancy team meet to review and update mid-course strategy.

Internal: Evening house search results in a short list of the final six prospects; and creative struggle to maintain internal life generates Roundtable muse and dialogue during the two-hour drive back to Tangerang.

Contradiction: Building futuristic image of the ICA through the Regional Consult while engaging the structures which are operating out of inadequate context. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Ten days of health training in Bontoa by local district health department officials for 40 men and women from the cluster villages culminates with examination (half pass from each village) and with symbolic commissioning by the Camat and health officials. A week of Practicum with baby weighing gets the practics under health caretaker's belt and the creation of song, story and symbol creates the spirit for implementation. USAID audit and site visit to Bontoa allows Bontoans to tell victories, show their chickens, rice, well and roads, resulting in a winning impression and a good audit.

Internal: Ann Epps and Eunice Shankland visit for framing and documentation, and ping-pong table engages youth in frantic competition.

Contradiction: Setting up Symposium organization committee while organizing troops for focused health implementation. (Wk. 12)\*

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: HDTs closes in Seoul and Jim Bell stays on to do documentation in Kuh Du E Ri. Kathleen Rees is sent out to the Philippines to enable HDTs set-up in Cebu. Development returns from Japan with great reports on new funding possibilities from religious orders.

Internal: House comes together for a great celebration marking the end of the quarter with a reflection on Quarter III and projection for Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Altering relationship to the future from one of concern to one of glorious anticipation. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: Affirmation of Nam Wai's four-year victory comes as village is the cover and feature article of Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce magazine (circulation: 2,500) and by a warm reception by Deputy Secretary of the New Territories and at a dinner given by the District Officer in his home. Regional Consult results are transformed into concrete images of transiting from a village project to a regional urban demonstration with six-month and Quarter IV plans completed.

Internal: This is bonanza month with 2/3 of House celebrating birthdays or anniversaries; Peter Ballard celebrates his seventh birthday having completed his first reading book.

Contradiction: Distributing the Regional Consult document when it is not translated or printed yet. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG**

External: Auxiliary and government official visit Kaohsiung jail to view small industry work and are impacted by the college/park appearance of the facility and the fact that no one is in the cells — everyone is working or in classes.

Internal: House celebrates Hong May Hsiang's completion of first year on the staff with movie, dinner and stories.

Contradiction: Getting momentum behind HDTs preparation while participation is still unclear. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: LENS marketing for '81-'82 is initiated. US\$1,750 is received for the week from ongoing development effort. Support work for first HDTs in China — scheduled for Hai Ou

Weeks 1-3 of Quarter IV — is underway. Imperial Chemical Industries (ICI) contacts us to arrange visit to consider training possibilities — such as LENS — for their affiliated companies in Taiwan.

Internal: February house finances are completed, and Anne Townley returns from Hong Kong Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Dealing decisively with the ambiguity of the role of the Regional Consult in Taipei and Kaohsiung in relation to the existing four-year strategy for Taiwan. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: House sends three for two-day site visit of villages surrounding Union Oil Geothermal Plant in Luzon. A speaking engagement is held with 60 grad students and professors of the Institute of Mass Communication at University of Philippines, and a follow-up call on Phil Com LENS results in another LENS scheduled for October. USAID impressed by field visits offers data-bank assistance with economic programs, Ministry of Health allocates free food for Mactan Early Learning Nutrition Center, and 1981 brochure is taken to printer.

Internal: Collegium study of Ezra Vogel's book, *Japan No. 1*, expands reflections on effective social vehicle for a small planet; and the House continues reflection on the role of an historical order through study of Rozak article and conversation with dinner guests, two religious, the dean and a theology professor of one of Manila's prestigious women's colleges.

Contradiction: Keeping our gaze on the next 20 years and our roots in the past 20 years while immediate opportunities and victories consume our passion. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Fifty stake signs are painted and stake leaders' names are indicated on doors. Eight hundred patients are treated in free clinics in all 24 villages, and 229 bags of skim milk are delivered (and cornsoya milk) from regional health office. Sudtonggan sign repair workday is held with snacks, and division meetings highlight preschool graduation preparation.

Internal: Infant baptismal rites are celebrated with House trip to beach.

Contradiction: Gearing up to climb the last peak of the mountain — the economic. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

External: City of Davao sends trucks of gravel and a grader for Langub road improvement. Carmin HDP holds cooperative store meeting to form two new stores and has the Population Commission conduct family planning day. Cluster Barangay (community) workers attend meeting in Ma-a with district officials.

Internal: House kitchen renovation is completed.

Contradiction: Getting water — newly repaired water pump still does not produce water. (Wk. 11)

### **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: The Kuh Du E Ri HDTs sends out 24 graduates and the Community Extension Module begins. Five from the House travel to Chung Ju to set up 26 Town Meetings for the coming week while Hong Kong Development arrives for an intensive week of development.

Internal: A Global Language School, visits from the Area Prior and Hong Kong Development push House accommodation to thirty, about the limit.

Contradiction: Keeping the troops out in front of the tactics. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI**

External: First product of the Kuh Du E Ri documentation is a picture/story book presented to ITT president during his visit to Korea. The coming of spring makes it possible to reopen the two preschools and use motorcycle for village visits. Staff goes to five of the expansion villages in preparation for the March Core meeting and to check on set up of cattle projects.

Internal: Regional planning meeting is a key event — planning next steps for Kuh Du E Ri and new villages, receiving three new interns and celebrating with a great bulgogi outdoor picnic.

Contradiction: Keeping permeation abundance in perspective. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Nagasaki circuit is set by Prefecture and seven towns are visited. Mr. Honda (new volunteer) teams up with Bob Hanson. LENS calls are made in Fukuoka City. GLS with eight participants (includes four Seiryō students and one Senan High School student) is a great event with two more scheduled in April. Two more Town Meetings are set in Okinawa for Week 13.

Internal: David Hutcheons is sent out to USA with a *Sayonara* breakfast in the Tokyo Hotel. Financial arrangements continue to be made for new facility.

Contradiction: Co-ordinating the move in the midst of programs. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Tokushima-ken Women's Hometown Culture Study Group Town Meeting deepens relationship with Tokushima Prefecture government. Volunteer Mr. Tajima attends his first Town Meeting as a translator and is impacted by a foreign method that is effective in Japan.

Internal: House scatters across Japan with Mrs. Yoshikawa in Hokkaido and Roger Marsh, Becky Boon and Haruko Ojima going to Shikoku; weekend of quarter discontinuity matches first weekend of spring weather.

Contradiction: Finding what invites the decision to participate for colleagues and staff. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO****SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE : SYDNEY**

External: House receives a \$5,000 contribution from AMAX and schedules first corporation LENS, first "Third Wave" seminar and the first community LENS for City of Darwin with large public sector involvement. Canberra circuit opens new contacts and nurtures old, while second Newcastle Roundtable is great success! Kuringgai launches municipality-wide awakening scheme.

Internal: Powells celebrate eighth anniversary *in absentia*, and House welcomes shift in internal schedule that releases Week II activity.

Contradiction: Using advantages in a few specific communities to build momentum across whole region. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE**

External: Dubbo circuit climaxes a week of victories with two aldermen endorsing an invitation letter to residents in the Orana Region for "Development in the '80s — The Orana Region" as a forerunner to and input for the Regional Consult. Key visits are made to incoming District Governor of Rotary, who is also Hospital Administrator and Councillor. In Murrin Bridge \$400 of soft goods is dispatched with another key meeting of the Industries Committee to deal with grant spending and decisions for marketing steps; night school

sewing classes begin with nine women and new boomerang maker begins work.

Internal: Management trek reminds House of global vision and expands troops by 100%; John Telford is sent out to Perth Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Finding the people who will risk designing the future. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Colleague David White joins team for 1200 km. circuit to Northam and Geraldton Metros which sets up five practicum events and team has fine visit with Bishop Howell Witt. Midland Toyota sends \$200 and first Symposium registration, plus \$500 annual pledge.

Internal: Management trek occasions reflection on new forms of the order, and Joanne Baker gets new job to be trained in phototypesetting.

Contradiction: Pulling new contacts and networks through the largely untried Regional Consult construct produces crisis of courage. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Regional team becomes an extremely mobile force as David White is welcomed back from Perth, Sue White is sent out to Apia and Judi Tippett is sent to Perth to prepare for and participate in the Regional Consults.

Internal: First House Church in new facility celebrates the moving, preparation and the management trek of the week.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between settling in and moving out on the road. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Planning meetings are scheduled for three Community LENS events. Receipt of \$1000 worth of inked canned goods staggers imagination relative to storage. Two proposals for Regional Consult funding are submitted.

Internal: Saturday planning session coordinates multiple tasks and assignment demands into a do-able transrational model.

Contradiction: Capturing people's passion with profundity of concise story of the times and necessity of the task. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

Internal: Fine decor workshop sets up command post and reveals again methods as life-giving tools.

Global Operations Centrum reports that the Sub-Continent reaches a consensus on the training events needed for the next few months — a three-week HDTI in Weeks 8-10 and a Human Development Course in the six active regions during Weeks 8-10. Hong Kong completes interchange packets for all houses including outstanding articles about Nam Wai, brooding collegiums and up-date on programs in Areas Hong Kong and Tokyo. North American priors pool learnings on Regional Consults and look toward July. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining coordination and service center dynamics in the centrum in the midst of intensive staff demands at Regional Consults.

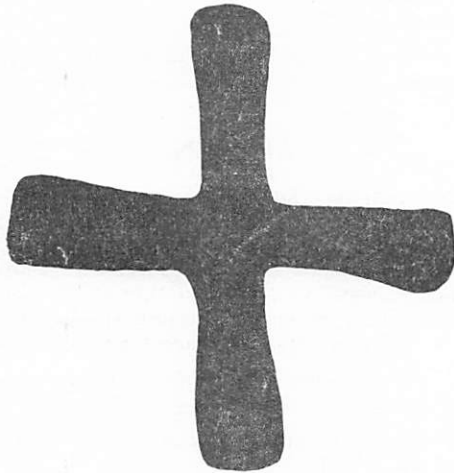
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that painting office space in Bombay Nexus brings new look and atmosphere to Management, while Hong Kong Nexus is catching up on O:E reports and producing *first* totally automatic monthly reports. At Chicago Nexus renovating the dishroom and inkinding very useable furniture are highlights of the week — which is also the first week of the ICA: Illinois audit. Finance troops in Chicago discern a new trend in audit preparation, while Hong Kong realizes that Management is charged with enabling future fiscal foundations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding a break in the action which allows consideration of the blocks to move to effective action.

External: Organization and hard work begin to pay off with stacks and stacks of materials rolling in for the Expositions, assignments of colleagues for workshops and talks, inked copier and paper from 3-M, and Madrid Metro recruitment blitz. To top it off a large grant from a multi-national company arrives.

Internal: Visitors drop in continually with registrations, materials, advice, lists of names and work for the conference as Bill returns from Glasgow Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Seeing conference not as end in itself but as a stepping stone toward the new vision. (Wk. 13)\*

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: This was a week of finishing our Symposium brochure, talking with five volunteers who showed up at our door, and visiting with several department heads at the Commonwealth Secretariat about the India Exposition.

Internal: Pleased with our fourth visitor from Japan this year, we welcomed Suemi Lanaki on her first stop of several houses in Europe as invitations are sent out to colleagues to join the Roundtable.

Contradiction: Trying to recruit 4 programs, do a CEM, develop continental bottom line and entertain a constant flow of guests and visitors. (Wk. 1)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Consult wrap-up achieves another victory with Rank Xerox saying yes to consult document inked printing. Fourth Edinburgh Youth Forum results in offers for Forums in other schools in Edinburgh.

Internal: Gerhard Ehler of Vienna revisits Tai'rgwaith, two and a half years after being here for the Consult; and House has tribal resettlement two weeks before moving to create more corporate space for Tai'rgwaith visits.

Contradiction: Shedding our ancient prejudices to allow documentation to enliven the "really new". (Wk. 1)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Circuit to Lille Metro, as follow-up to the Regional Consult, shows a second command performance of the global film, to the same group on the same night. Week II area-check session reflects on the past quarter, creates artform of Quarter IV's broad strategies and writes the Paris Regional Consult report letter.

Internal: Area celebrates Jean-Baptiste's birthday with a rowdy steak dinner.

Contradiction: Swirling all the practices, strategies and tactics into a win. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Week 10 Europe Continent Area Priors check-signal meeting turns out to be amazingly easy to do.

Internal: Week II conversations on GRA '81 holds unity in the midst of diverse tasks.

Contradiction: Building the model that utilizes all resources to get a lot done and have fun. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: All three rings of the circus are in full swing — film and speaking events in Eastern Belgium, preparations for NGO permeation, job conversations with top officials of General Motors and International Harvester. India guest night nets volunteers to clean Fortnight facility from EEC.

Internal: House receives Mary Quinn, volunteer from Britain for four-six weeks, who begins to bring some order to the order.

Contradiction: Creating decor that symbolizes intent of victorious fortnight recruitment. (Wk. 11)

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Ten-week focus on Regional Consult culminates in the opening event — the Symposium — as 28 colleagues attend with the leadership of all sessions in the hands of the movement. Inked victories surprise staff with their ease and quickness. First contact with groups dealing with foreign residents of Frankfurt result in interest in future cooperation.

Internal: House fills up as numbers swell to 25 over the weekend and Symposium celebration Saturday night maintains a local tradition with a keg (of inked beer) opening ceremony, fine buffet, music and conversation — master of ceremonies is movement colleague.

Contradiction: Deepening and broadening relationship with colleagues who have been interested but unfocused and unengaged. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Seven faculty and students at the technical school in nearby city of Hilversum are awakened with context and demonstration community forum to concrete planning methods at special meeting for solidifying goals of their group, "Development Aid". They suggest a full-day forum next in order to do the job comprehensively. Another 5000 Guilders arrives as support from religious orders continues.

Internal: End of quarter celebration is enlivened by news of new jobs for self-support, and a dramatic reading of the play from last summer's E.G. Camp, "The Gift", illuminates the role of the Exemplar. C. Widyatma arrives from Brussels Nexus to enable circuits and house ontology is balanced once again.

Contradiction: Expecting key local support when the leadership is unself-conscious about the role they need to play in recreating polity forms for local communities. (Wk. 1)\*

Internal: Garnet and Andrew return from Regional Consults in Frankfurt and Glasgow, and Paige Fisher visits for NGO appointments.

Contradiction: Recruiting for Formation Fortnight, with Regional Consult looming ahead and all its set-up getting underway. (Wk. 13)\*

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA**

External: El Alalma diesel arrives. 90% of squash seed seeds sprout in desert reclamation farm, and play equipment is erected in community center playground. Danish Church Aid representative tours Bayad and recommends US\$10,000 request. Women's health and literacy classes are initiated in three villages as Quarter IV opens in high gear.

Internal: New Roundtable construct proves workable in third world situation.

Contradiction: Clarifying tactics to confirm quickly key authorization affirmation of Race four-year plan initiation. (Wk. 1)

### **ABIDJAN**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Endorsement of LENS by the Deputy General Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce and the Ivory Coast School for Corporation Directors provides a realistic LENS marketing strategy. A "Month of Human Development" construct including the Regional Consult, a two-week training design and village development cluster initiation is created.

Internal: The regional team is expanded as Ivoirian sociologist comes daily to work with the ICA.

Contradiction: Enlarging the space to correspond with missional task. (Wk. 11)

### **KINSHASA**

### **NAIROBI**

External: House has a stunning week doing three province sublocation cluster consults involving 20 villages and over 20,000 people while at the same time finishing the printing of five consult documents. Two weeks of intensified work with EEC produces approval for major grant and Kenya Government Director of Agriculture, Mr. Muthama, agrees to be on the International Working Committee for the Exposition on Rural Reconstruction.

Internal: Week of preparation for everyone returning and preparing for solid Week 1 planning produces hotel dinner, fish and plates and cups for 50, and four cases of beer; and major transformation of house is done by hanging plants and new pictures.

Contradiction: Grasping thrust in light of fantastic explosion of Quarter III. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA**

### **BOMBAY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: Bombay Regional Consult catalyses enthusiastic four-sector participation in Symposium and Chikhale cluster consults. One hundred people participate in Symposium and 250 villages (including 100 women) plus consultants and ICA staff participate in tactics plenary. Canara Bank appeal to its customers raises Rs. 27,000 for Consult events! Water victories occur as Rs. 7 lakh irrigation scheme for Kendur is finally sanctioned after four years of pushing and waiting, and Kirloskar water expert announces startling irrigation potential for "green revolution" in Jawale cluster.

Internal: In the midst of the whirl of guests and activities of the Bombay Consult, the Nexus sends out Faith Vance to Brussels and celebrates Christine Mead's 24th birthday with an engraved water melon and a fruit feast. Great collegium on South Africa as the magazine *South* illuminates Third World dynamics.

Contradiction: Formulating model for engaging appropriately the four-sector forces uncovered by Regional Consults. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY**

### **DELHI**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Gram Sabhas (community forums) are held in last two cluster villages and maneuver culminates in a Cluster Assembly which is also attended by BDO (Block Development Officers) and district officials. Women's meeting in Sikror decides to start a sewing cooperative to manufacture factory uniforms; two machines are inkinded and four factories give tentative orders. INALSA, UNICEF, Family Planning Foundation, Abner School, Dutch Embassy, MODI's, a Minneapolis guardian, Mary D'Souza and Faith Vance from Brussels all visit Sikror in a ten-day period.

Internal: House welcomes the Prakash family to their new assignment in Delhi. Inkind typewriter, TV and two motorbikes arrive, and a free taxi is put at our disposal; the old Delhi office is given a facelift with fresh paint inside and out.

Contradiction: Deciding how much to commit staff to in the cluster and how much to leave open to openings of the Regional Consult. (Wk. 11)

### **MADRAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Weavers' meeting opens new possibilities for blanket markets. Construction of five community-fund-subsidized houses begins. Collection of equipment for hybrid cattle program starts with arrival of a big castrator and order of a liquid nitrogen container.

Internal: Kale family is assigned to Bombay Regional Consult, and self-support collegium starts the stew on bottom lines, ways and means.

Contradiction: Creating a vital role for the village among the four sectors of the Nadlapur coalition. (Wk. 13)\*

### **CALCUTTA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Regional Consult gains momentum with first steering committee meeting and first yes to host committee. Metal Box LENS is completed, and Bata India requests one more LENS as soon as possible with Marketing Division.

Internal: House sends Michael Arulswamy to Bombay Regional Consult, Duncan Holmes returns to Hyderabad after LENS, B. Kumar, a regional colleague, visits while attending steering committee meeting, and Nexus troops arrive to set up Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Focussing practical images of momentum as six-week countdown for Regional Consult begins. (Wk. 11)

### **SINGAPORE**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Nexus arranges meeting between a Chinese Industrialist and Kuala Lumpur Regional team for Consult set-up. Nexus launches Australian Audit by sending Mike Hoff to Area Sydney.

Internal: House holds a superb Roundtable with three adults, three E.G. and Horton.

Contradiction: Figuring out how to keep on top with forces cut to 67% and tasks up by 167%. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: Socio-Economic Planning Unit of Prime Minister's Department offers introduction to Chief Secretary of State, commits branch offices to assist in Regional Consult Practicum and plans to provide Malay-speaking workshop leaders. Routine call on computer firm turns up a passionate "hunter-warrior" engaged in innovative public-private co-venture in rural development — a perfect panelist for the Symposium. First Sungai Lui resident participates in Symposium workshop-leaders training.

Internal: Jill's birthday is celebrated on March 17 with a unique cottage cheese birthday cake.

Contradiction: Relating corporate thinking-through of strategies to key Regional Consult issues. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: "On the river and the road" week culminates in great symbolic meeting of Cluster village leaders to present the typewriters and sewing machines they had decided to buy with the Australian Ambassador's money. Visit with District Village Development Department prepares next step in village leadership training in the methods for the *Kecamatan Tanjung Pura*. Guardians in Medan prepare the way to broader frame through LENS Business Forum for small businesses set-up, and ICA staff are invited to two business meetings of national and extra-national businesses as guardians open more doors for funds and ways to assist North Sumatra development efforts.

Internal: Third conversation on the future of the family impacts House Week II brooding on "where are we the experiment on behalf of the future" as it comes at the end of Indonesian staff's engagement celebration.

Contradiction: Releasing implementation modules in Kecamatan together with the coalition instead of "by ourselves" circuits in spite of delays in Kecamatan LENS. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: LENS with Pertamina (National Oil Company), focusing on how the public relations department can launch a program to demonstrate effective human development, signals openings for further consultation with upper level management. Visit with the Director General of the Department of Social Affairs assures DEPSOS sponsorship of the Regional Consult. All four members of the Mobil consultancy team meet to review and update mid-course strategy.

Internal: Evening house search results in a short list of the final six prospects; and creative struggle to maintain internal life generates Roundtable muse and dialogue during the two-hour drive back to Tangerang.

Contradiction: Building futuric image of the ICA through the Regional Consult while engaging the structures which are operating out of inadequate context. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Regional Consult organizing meeting with assistant governor and representatives of three government agencies makes assignments for Symposium and field work preparation for Consult three weeks away. Health implementation is launched in all six villages with Prokesa (health worker) interchange for baby weighing. Local clinic distributes medicine to two Prokesa from each village and 35 meet at end of week for presentation of "medicine bags" and for reflection. Brian and Russell dig up Bontoa with other youth to begin gardens.

Internal: House sends out guardian David Thomas after a month's stay to Australia.

Contradiction: Integrating preschool and health implementation to maintain momentum while Regional Consult tasks are at hand. (Wk. 13)\*

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development and Management team produce a computerized corporation data-compilation for the zone. James Bell travels to Taiwan with Alan Wong, nexus sojourner, to attend the HDTs in Hai Ou.

Internal: The centrums celebrate the quarter with fine excursions into the great city of Hong Kong, and Happy Hours mark the discontinuous week as all other activities are intensified.

Contradiction: Focusing multiple visions of significant future engagement for corporate contradiction analysis and related tactical activity in Regional Consults, program planning and financial responsibility. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Village farmer approaches House for help in growing mushrooms and is taken on tour of only mushroom farm in Hong Kong — discovered during the Regional Consult. Intensive development week set-up nets 25 calls with more come.

Internal: Roundtable study of "Person/Planet" reminds House of crucial role that religious orders play in the civilizing process.

Contradiction: Shifting the Tuesday night task force of Chinese colleagues from simply translation work to being a regional task force which will implement impact maneuvers. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Auxiliary and government official visit Kaohsiung jail to view small industry work and are impacted by the college/park appearance of the facility and the fact that no one is in the cells — everyone is working or in classes.

Internal: House celebrates Hong May Hsiang's completion of first year on the staff with movie, dinner and stories.

Contradiction: Getting momentum behind HDTs preparation while participation is still unclear. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: LENS marketing for '81-'82 is initiated. US\$1,750 is received for the week from ongoing development effort. Support work for first HDTs in China — scheduled for Hai Ou Weeks 1-3 of Quarter IV — is underway. Imperial Chemical Industries (ICI) contacts staff to arrange visit to consider training possibilities — such as LENS — for their affiliated companies in Taiwan.

Internal: February house finances are completed, and Anne Townley returns from Hong Kong Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Dealing decisively with the ambiguity of the role of the Regional Consult in Taipei and Kaohsiung in relation to the existing four-year strategy for Taiwan. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: House sends three for two-day site visit of villages surrounding Union Oil Geothermal Plant in Luzon. A speaking engagement is held with 60 grad students and professors of the Institute of Mass Communication at University of Philippines, and a follow-up call on Phil Com LENS results in another LENS scheduled for October. USAID impressed by field visits offers data-bank assistance with economic programs, Ministry of Health allocates free food for Mactan Early Learning Nutrition Center, and 1981 brochure is taken to printer.

Internal: Collegium study of Ezra Vogel's book, *Japan No. 1*, expands reflections on effective social vehicle for a small planet; and the House continues reflection on the role of an historical order through study of Rozak article and conversation with dinner guests, two religious, the dean and a theology professor of one of Manila's prestigious women's colleges.

Contradiction: Keeping our gaze on the next 20 years and our roots in the past 20 years while immediate opportunities and victories consume our passion. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Fifty stake signs are painted and stake leaders' names are indicated on doors. Eight hundred patients are treated in free clinics in all 24 villages, and 229 bags of skim milk are delivered (and cornsoya milk) from regional health office. Sudtonggan sign repair workday is held with snacks, and division meetings highlight preschool graduation preparation.

Internal: Infant baptismal rites are celebrated with House trip to beach.

Contradiction: Gearing up to climb the last peak of the mountain — the economic. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Monthly weighing of all children in the six cluster preschools is completed. Quarterly inventories and financial reports on four cluster general stores are completed, new Carmin HDP general store begins operation, and Luman Parents Association makes loan to general store for first coke consignment. Barangay Health Training program begins, conducted by city health office with ten health caretakers from Langub HDP and five from Magtuo HDP.

Internal: Knutsuns return from development trek.

Contradiction: Preparing for the Regional Consult. (Wk. 12)\*

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: A successful general LENS is held with one ICA staff, three guardians and two sojourners as the team. House prior and guardian travel to Sapporo to lead two LENS seminars.

Internal: Priors of four regions in Japan meet in Tokyo; Miss Suemi Tanaka from Osaka joins the full-time staff; and new 30-room house now has 21 residents with space for only two more.

Contradiction: Aligning the Regional Consult with other priorities and demands. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Kuh Du E Ri clearbook is completed and delivered to ITT Chairman, Mr. Araskog, who is in Korea for a conference with President Chun. Team does a metro trip to Incheon to confer with colleague Maeng Un Chae, who is running for Congress on the government ticket.

Internal: House holds an order celebration for Mr. Lee Kang Jin who completes his intern year and for Lee Kyung Hae, Kim Eun Jung and Oh Hae Sook who start theirs — all this after a great regional planning council.

Contradiction: Coordinating the forces so that all balls stay in the air. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI

External: First product of Kuh Du E Ri documentation is a picture/story book presented to ITT president during his visit to Korea. The coming of spring makes it possible to reopen the two preschools and use motorcycle for village visits. Staff goes to five of the expansion villages in preparation for the March core meeting and to check on set up of cattle projects.

Internal: Regional planning meeting is a key event — planning next steps for Kuh Du ERi and new villages, receiving three new interns and celebrating with a great bulgogi outdoor picnic.

Contradiction: Keeping the permeation abundance in perspective. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Nagasaki circuit is set up for April 21-23, to five communities. Nishitetsu (the second largest employer company in the prefecture) sets LENS date for May with 30 people. Global Language School turns out to be a great session with five participants including new sojourner.

Internal: House moves to a new location in a Japanese-style Ryokan (inn) with help from Kyle Knutson here from Tokyo House for the week and two high school students; and the fruitman Ikuko Forokawa moves into the new house as resident volunteer from Nagasaki Prefecture.

Contradiction: Developing a new style and structures in new quarter in new house configuration. (Wk. 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Guardian Lunch kicks off quarter's recruitment for Regional Consult and June LENS Symposium. Roundtable begins study of Soedjatmoko's *Development and Freedom*. Ruth Reames begins one day a week volunteer schedule.

Internal: Friday's Roundtable Egyptian feast sends out colleague Hiromi Hikosaka to a year of study in Cairo, Saturday *Sayonara* party sends out intern Haruko Ojima to new life in Austria, and House hosts M.M. Chakraboty from Calcutta on his world bicycle tour.

Contradiction: Celebrating the victories in the midst of the mundane. (Wk. 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO**

External: First LENS Symposium in Hokkaido is held in Sapporo on March 13-15 with 16 participants representing companies, government and voluntary organizations. Speech on *The Third Wave* is well received by South Sapporo Rotary Club and is followed by publishing a brochure of a Third Wave Seminar for businessmen. Fourth Annual Oyubari Snow Festival is sponsored by the Youth Club and involves more than 60 Oyubari children.

Internal: House and colleagues participate in great LENS celebration at Sapporo Beer Garden followed by disco dancing in Susukino. Naomi Sato graduates from kindergarten and children begin vacation for two weeks between school years.

Contradiction: Taking a close look at financial priorities picture including program and self-support funds. (Wk. 12)\*

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: GWF is set up with Liverpool community (urban suburb of Sydney) for April 30. Call with Qantas, Australian National Airlines, gives a yes for vision section of LENS in April. Over 80 invitations are sent out for Guardians Dinner and a meeting is scheduled for May 8 and 9 in Sydney.

Internal: House celebrates fast and vegemite broth, sends out Telakau to help with Murrin Bridge CEM preparation and hosts Mike Hoff and Teresa Lingafelter for the Sydney audit and Marsha Stansbury for development.

Contradiction: Building the guidelines for the Regional Consult which will enable the event to be a winning strategy. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE**

External: Relationship between public and local sectors is acted out as Health Commission employees request to work with the community care workers in the arena of preventive health.

Internal: The presence of Vaoita Telakau in the House enlivens the spirit as well as addresses the community's image of who decides to be those who care.

Contradiction: Getting people to meet out of a need rather than a whim. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: The Ottawa Valley Potential is becoming a "by-word" as three unsolicited requests come in, another news article appears and the MPP says he's coming for sure. Office and overnight accommodations are secured in Pembroke as well as government and private funding possibilities.

Internal: Sunday drive "up the Valley" reveals a rural paradise and a colleague with "resort" quality location that staff are invited out to anytime. Kitney's report on Jamacia is a refreshingly objective source of support.

Contradiction: Leaping to match the enthusiastic response of Valley people when this pace seems to be the winning one. (Wk. 1)\*

Thirty visits result in paid registrations and scholarship money. Ronnie LaPointe says that having regional colleagues on calls is incalculable in telling great success of Lorne.

Internal: Fine decor workshop sets up command post and reveals again methods as life-giving tools.

Contradiction: Establishing command post systems for expanding total arena advance. (Wk. 12)

### MEXICO CITY

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: Demonstration/Training Agriculture *Parcela* is covering its own expenses with a daily harvest of pickles after only one month of operation. An increasing number of Conacaste farmers are visiting the *Parcela*, excited with what they see and requesting participation in the irrigation scheme on their own land. Development team brings in \$1,600 and full truck of inkind materials. A.I.D. man from Washington is pleased with visit to Conacaste and promises a good report of the Project.

Internal: Auxiliary workday in the *Parcela* provides a great occasion for city and project teams to pour corporate energy into one task.

Contradiction: Enabling commonly focused and executed maneuvers in the midst of radical fragmentation. (Wk. 13)\*

### HAVANA

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: *The Jamaican Potential: a consultation on Human Development in the 80's* is officially co-sponsored by the Ministry of Youth and Community Development, the Private Sector Organization of Jamaica, the Council of Voluntary Social Services, the Woburn Lawn Economic Development Co-operative Society, Limited, the University of the West Indies and the Institute of Cultural Affairs. Walls and doors go up on second building of the training center.

Internal: Helen landing self-support English job, Rod leaving for U.S. self-support excursion and morning Order Training for the Surinamese sojourners allow staff to see that life is fulfilled.

Contradiction: Sensing after structures which enable movementalizing of 15%. (Wk. 13)\*

## **BUENOS AIRES**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Sol wins division football (soccer) championship; eighteen come to Consejo weekly meeting (community board). John Conroy of Catholic Relief Services visits project with two others from their Latin American desk. Viewing TV tape of Sol is highlight; it is short (seven minutes), comprehensive and artistically done — the crew from Teloton donates a tape for ICA's use.

Internal: Collegium of screen and steps involved in making comprehensive vocational decision is highlight.

Contradiction: Creating ways to release Chilean money so that Regional Consult and Lima HDTS become realized dreams and not just good ideas. (Wk. 11)

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Excursion to Region Recife nets three Community Forums with participants in each overflowing from the rooms. New contacts are made with invitations for a continued presence in Recife. ITT continues another year of financial support.

Internal: Completion of 1980 financial books and set-up of Alpha system are applauded! Preparation for house move excites all as John Joseph Slicker celebrates fifth birthday.

Contradiction: Insuring that presence in Banareiras is profound with delay in house move. (Wk. 13)\*

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports 30 appointments in Hong Kong using new materials; distribution form Chicago to all houses of new ICA brochure and presentation folder; Guardians meeting in Chicago focused on four-sector research along with the hosting of one of our patrons; surprise Easter card received in Chicago includes \$25,000 check; Jakarta and Kuala Lumpur Regional Consults receive yes from national leadership. Renewed emphasis on adequate tracking of foundation and corporation histories with sophistication of "HK File System", computerization of much data, and Quarter IV plans for further data retrieval are the breakthroughs and trends. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning catalytic tools for intensifying "Every person a Developer" and intensifying the next phases of constituency emphasis.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports that Singapore "zone" has each region assigned an edge PSU, and procedures with supporting materials are mailed. Sinex talking paper on the Human Factor is excellent work and draws out the creativity of others in the band. Ray Caruso visits Chicago Nexus to provide interim data on where McDonald's permeation lab stands and where it is headed. Chicago Nexus pulls off Week II discontinuity with skeleton crew left behind (then also going out the next Week II); Lingo's conversation on discontinuity reveals numerous family discoveries in the city as well as bringing self-conscious intentionality to the two days. The key contradiction lies in the arena of Centrum configuration as the Nexus goes through a transition toward preparation for July '81: how to know what stitches can be dropped and which ones redirected into the total fabric.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports that each region in the Singapore zone is assigned an edge PSU. The ICA is registered in Mexico, with papers signed and Board of Advisors in place. Three LENS are held simaltenously in Atlanta with 126 participants — the first McDonald's LENS with store managers. The Global Academy participates in a demonstration LENS and has a new collegium series on the recovery of spirit. The key contradiction is in the arena of clarifying priorities and configurations in order to respond to the particular reality of April-June 1981.

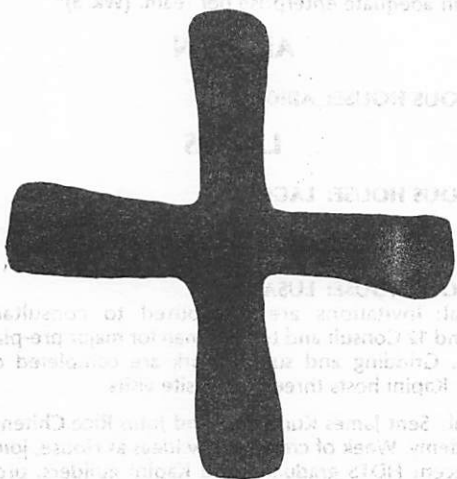
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Internal: Pleased with our fourth visitor from Japan this year, we welcomed Suemi Lanaki on her first stop of several houses in Europe as invitations are sent out to colleagues to join the Roundtable.

Contradiction: Trying to recruit 4 programs, do a CEM, develop continental bottom line and entertain a constant flow of guests and visitors. (Wk. 1)

Internal: Rafos' collegiums give opportunity to get inside what's happening in Africa.

Contradiction: Finding ways and means to get in touch with those who care. (Wk. 2)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Recruitment for Formation Fortnight moves into high gear with regional colleagues plugging in fulltime. Social peremation in Brussels moves on forming women's guild.

Internal: The wonder and glory of becoming five is recreated for all as Aidan Fisher celebrates birthday.

Contradiction: Maintaining a corporate sense of being as intensity of Fortnight preparation focuses all endeavors. (Wk. 1)\*

Contradiction: Figuring out how to keep on top with forces cut to 67% and tasks up by 167%. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: Socio-Economic Planning Unit of Prime Minister's Department offers introduction to Chief Secretary of State, commits branch offices to assist in Regional Consult Practicum and plans to provide Malay-speaking workshop leaders. **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

guardians with surprising passion. Wall of Wonder of victories since the Regional Consult allows new self-consciousness of regional teams' victories and the journey it has been. Quarter IV planning by Bubun-Kecamatan Demonstration team and Human Development Extension team allows formation of a comprehensive picture of metro cadre, guardian, local demonstration laboratory activity and corporate assignments, including Medan Guardians GRA '81 assignments.

Contradiction: Enabling Bubun to continue to rehearse their victories reported in Regional Consult. (Wk. 13)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Regional Consult organizing meeting with assistant governor and representatives of three government agencies makes assignments for Symposium and field work preparation for Consult three weeks away. Health implementation is launched in all six villages with Prokesa (health worker) interchange for baby weighing. Local clinic distributes medicine to two Prokesa from each village and 35 meet at end of week for presentation of "medicine bags" and for reflection. Internal: House sends out guardian David Thomas after a month's stay to Australia.

Internal: House celebrates Hong May Hsiang's completion of first year on the staff with movie, dinner and stories.

Contradiction: Getting momentum behind HDTS preparation while participation is still unclear. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: LENS visits with auditor and Goodyear Company result in potential set-ups for early Quarter II and possible glimpse into program for next year.

Internal: Dynamic of Wayside Inn again intensifies as Alan Wang comes from Hong Kong, then travels south with Macomber to HDTS in Hai Ou; and Yallops arrive from Hong Kong for development.

Contradiction: Positioning for self-support and consultation program in 1981-82 while maintaining pressure on existing priorities, including Regional Consult. (Wk. 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Fifty stake signs are painted and stake leaders' names are indicated on doors. Eight hundred patients are treated in free clinics in all 24 villages, and 229 bags of skim milk are delivered (and cornsoya milk) from regional health office. ### **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: A successful general LENS is held with one ICA staff, three guardians and two sojourners as the team. House prior and guardian travel to Sapporo to lead two LENS seminars.

Internal: Priors of four regions in Japan meet in Tokyo; Miss Suemi Tanaka from Osaka joins the full-time staff; and new 30-room house has 21 residents with space for two more.

Contradiction: Aligning the Regional Consult with other priorities and demands. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Kuh Du E Ri clearbook is completed and delivered to ITT Chairman, Mr. Araskog, who is in Korea for a conference with President Chun. Team does a metro trip to Incheon to confer with colleague Maeng Un Chae, who is running for Congress on the government ticket.

Internal: House holds an order celebration for Mr. Lee Kang Jin who completes his intern year and for Lee Kyung Hae, Kim Eun Jung and Oh Hae Sook who start theirs — all this after a great regional planning council.

Contradiction: Coordinating the forces so that all balls stay in the air. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI**

External: First product of Kuh Du E Ri documentation is a picture/story book presented to ITT president during his visit to Korea. The coming of spring makes it possible to reopen the two preschools and use motorcycle for village visits. Staff goes to five of the expansion villages in preparation for the March core meeting and to check on set up of cattle projects.

Internal: Regional planning meeting is a key event — planning next steps for Kuh Du E Ri and new villages, receiving three new interns and celebrating with a great bulgogi outdoor picnic.

Contradiction: Keeping the permeation abundance in perspective. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Nagasaki circuit is set up for April 21-23, to five communities. Nishitetsu (the second largest employer company in the prefecture) sets LENS date for May with 30 people. Global Language School turns out to be a great session with five participants including new sojourner.

Internal: House moves to a new location in a Japanese-style Ryokan (inn) with help from Kyle Knutson here from Tokyo House for the week and two high school students; and the fruitman Ikuko Forokawa moves into the new house as resident volunteer from Nagasaki Prefecture.

Contradiction: Developing a new style and structures in new quarter in new house configuration. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Guardian Lunch kicks off quarter's recruitment for Regional Consult and June LENS Symposium. Roundtable begins study of Soedjatmoko's *Development and Freedom*. Ruth Reames begins one day a week volunteer schedule.

Internal: Friday's Roundtable Egyptian feast sends out colleague Hiromi Hikosaka to a year of study in Cario, Saturday Sayonara party sends out intern Haruko Ojima to new life in Austria, and House hosts M.M. Chakraborty from Calcutta on his world bicycle tour.

Contradiction: Celebrating the victories in the midst of the mundane. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO**

External: First Community LENS in Japan is held in Yubari City with representatives from government, business, labor unions, women's clubs, youth clubs, Jaycees, elders and all geographic communities. NOMA (Japanese management group) sponsors three-hour LENS methods workshop, lead by Don Clark and George Kawai, for representatives of 15 Sapporo companies. Talk on internationalism using *Third Wave* images is given to Kitamura village youth club.

Internal: Mr. Tonosaki's 24th birthday is celebrated by Yubari LENS staff and Mr. Mori and Mr. Morimoto from Yubari newspaper and Chamber of Commerce, at Japanese-style inn during the LENS course. Seventeen staff and colleagues expand the seams of the Sapporo House, including Mr. Clark and Mr. Kawai from Tokyo, and Miss Tanaka and Miss Yoshikawa from Osaka.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers to make programs self-supporting. (Wk. 13)\*

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: GWF is set up with Liverpool community (urban suburb of Sydney) for April 30. Call with Qantas, Australian National Airlines, gives a yes for vision section of LENS in April. Over 80 invitations are sent out for Guardians Dinner and a meeting is scheduled for May 8 and 9 in Sydney.

Internal: House celebrates fast and vegemite broth, sends out Telakau to help with Murrin Bridge CEM preparation and

hosts Mike Hoff and Teresa Lingafelter for the Sydney audit and Marsha Stansbury for development.

Contradiction: Building the guidelines for the Regional Consult which will enable the event to be a winning strategy. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE**

External: Relationship between public and local sectors is acted out as Health Commission employees request to work with community care workers in arena of preventive health.

Internal: The presence of Vaoita Telakau in the House enlivens the spirit as well as addresses the community's image of who decides to be those who care.

Contradiction: Getting people to meet out of a need rather than a whim. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

Thirty visits result in paid. registrations and scholarship money. Ronnie LaPointe says that having regional colleagues on calls is incalculable in telling great success of Lorne.

Internal: Fine decor workshop sets up command post and reveals again methods as life-giving tools.

Contradiction: Establishing command post systems for expanding total arena advance. (Wk. 12)

## **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Demonstration/Training Agriculture *Parcela* is covering its own expenses with a daily harvest of pickles after only one month of operation. An increasing number of Conacaste farmers are visiting the *Parcela*, excited with what they see and requesting participation in the irrigation scheme

on their own land. Development team brings in \$1,600 and full truck of inked materials. A.I.D. man from Washington is pleased with visit to Conacaste and promises a good report of the Project.

Internal: Auxiliary workday in the *Parcela* provides a great occasion for city and project teams to pour corporate energy into one task.

Contradiction: Enabling commonly focused and executed maneuvers in the midst of radical fragmentation. (Wk. 13)

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Fourth regional team meeting is held with 15 colleagues representing five local communities, JAMAL and the Methodist Church; plan is created for fund raising for Blue Mountain Zone representation in the National Consultation. Claverty Cottage circuit holds two film showings and workshops. Australian High Commission gives Ja \$2,500 to Woburn Lawn Co-op for industry shed construction. Ministry of Agriculture donates car, driver and gas for nine day Practium set-up trip, and Social Development Commission Training Director is assigned to accompany ICA.

Contradiction: Creating space arrangement maneuvers to house effectively the training school in Azpitia. (Wk. 1)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: The Barlovento villages assembly brings 10 self-conscious villages into an all-day planning session from which emerges the need for cadres and visible miracles in each before July. Transportation is provided for over 100 villagers by *Federacion Campesina*, whose director spontaneously shows up with music and loud speaker in the plaza of Cano Negro, announcing their co-sponsorship of the event. Twelve passports are secured by Barloventanians planning to go to Lima GMS, three stay over to develop funds for their travel, and fund-raising events are planned for all five of the villages that they represent.

House experiences a week of comings and goings as Diane and Joanna travel to Curacao to renew their visas, Cliff leaves for Jamaica, John Foss visits from Minneapolis and Rod comes back from permeation in New York.

Contradiction: Implementing our consensus on 10 Barlovento communities, metro circuits, 15% engagement and development as they simultaneously move into new orbits. (Wk. 1)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that "Preparation Blitz" by five troops takes place on ITT proposal for HDPs in the Philippines, Venezuela and Egypt. The 1981 Annual Report becomes a major focus for the Public Profile Team. North American Teams are strengthened with the addition of three new troops. Quarter planning at the Brussels Nexus produces maneuvers containing three months of bottom lines. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating a corporate timeline which focuses on critical do's for the rest of the quarter.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that in preparation for Formation Fortnight the first draft is written for 4-sessions modules including motivity exercise laboratories. Quarter IV maneuvers are built and time is telescoped (shortened) to eight weeks. Maundy Thursday celebrative and reflective evening with candle-light and Common Meal significantly marks the Holy Week Season. A 14-hour journey through the Fourteen Stations of the Cross in Chicago Nexus Religious House utilizes ancient, external poetry to occasion an interior journey into socio-spirit guidehood. The key contradiction lies in the arena of Quarter IV time design and configuration as centrum experiences an unsettling transition of daily and weekly alterations and cross-centrum work on July preparation, assignments, methods and publications.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Brussels builds inclusive systems (recruitment, design, support, practices) for Formation Fortnight. Chicago centrum staff supports Regional Consults in Kingston, Halifax and Toronto and a CYF in Chicago. Centrum reviews January planning and clarifies priorities for the remaining nine weeks of the quarter. Korean pastor gives church lecture in Academy, using Martin Luther's (16th century German) *sola fide* (by faith alone). The key contradiction lies in the arena of assignments for the staffing of Regional Consults as their numbers increase.

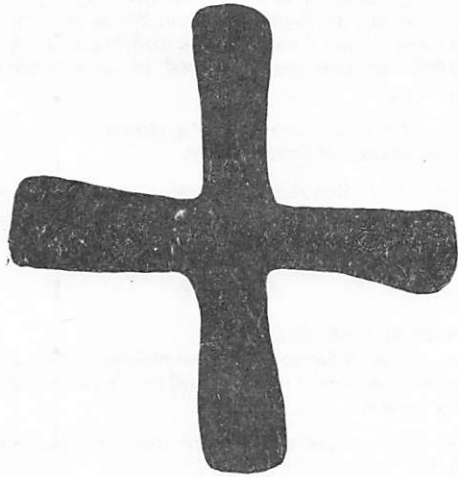
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: John and Thea have tea at House of Lords with Lord George McLeod (Founder of Iona Community) who was pleased to be up-dated in current ICA programs and expressed request to visit London House in future. London sends four full-time non-Order participants to Formation Fortnight in Brussels.

Internal: London House E.G. visit Tai'rgwaith HDP during Easter School Vacation (highlight was climbing "coal tips"). House sends out Liza Tod and Mary Murphy to Formation Fortnight.

Contradiction: Performing necessary "Snake-eyes" across all work arenas in order to see assured victory! (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Xaverian Fathers say yes to attending Social Methods Course beginning Week 6. Aberdeen University requests film and possible V.O.W. in autumn.

Internal: Collegium room gets coating of paint as House breaks up for Easter discontinuity.

Internal: April snow storm does not deter House move to Cardiff.

Contradiction: Drinking wine given by new landlord without a corkscrew. (Wk. 4)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Guardian from Grenoble visits and is excited by report on Regional Consult. The conversation once again exposes the needs of rural France and informs House of its future work in Region Lyon.

Internal: Remaining House members (others at Formation Fortnight Bruxelles) celebrate and rehearse event of Easter story with fine morning House Church feast, traditional egg decorating and egg hunt and holiday work-day which completes a number of protracted tasks.

Contradiction: Tying together day-to-day practics with an over-all strategic image. (Wk. 4)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Global Formation Fortnight task force gathered together in fortnight facility to do practical recruitment and construct preparation engages many colleagues and Houses of Europe in one thrust.

Internal: House welcomes arrival of six people from Egypt to participate full-time in Fortnight.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

Contradiction: Having focussed all thoughts on fortnight preparation and finding many future and bracketed tasks to be attended to. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: House is engaged in last-minute blitz to recruit the Fortnight.

Internal: First interview with large multi-national raises hopes of solving area and house self-support.

Contradiction: Admit excitement of launching Continental Fortnight, questions of the future loom in terms of continuation of a three-person house or a three or four-person house in general. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

Contradiction: Symbolizing death ground for troops scattered across several metros. (Wk. 5)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: New contacts are made and intrigue over Order Ecuminical is discovered during circuit which covers three metros. Keynote speaker for planned Regional Conference decides to use his office with government social services arm to enable ICA image and frame.

Internal: House joins in spirit of glorious Spring by participating in ten-acre tulip festival celebration at Keukenhof and national celebration of the Queen's Birthday, celebrated in local community with sidewalk bazaars, staged entertainment and night-time dancing.

Contradiction: Catalyzing reality of grassroots participation in Regional Conference in midst of lack of leadership support and slow response to invitations which blocks strategic view of the future. (Wk. 5)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Second meeting about LENS happens with government agency, in addition to two other references from Rafos visit.

Internal: Toffler reading reveals East-West as one industrial reality and gives permission to invent new foundation out of own experience.

Contradiction: Looking at Social Process Triangle, NRM, Profound Humanness chart etc. reveals arenas of unclarity with need for method to readjust. (Wk. 2)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: Seminar with the Divine Word Fathers — 45 participants from 14 nations — deals with planning methods. House reaches goal of 20 participants coming from 11 different nations for second religious order seminar. Bishop James Mathews and Fr. Marcel Ranville from Caracas make visits on Vatican congregations and religious orders and visit two cardinals. They have front row seats at Palm Sunday Mass in St. Peter's Square.

Internal: Brochures are mailed for Regional Consult. The youth (one half of Rome House) are sent to Brussels to enable Formation Fortnight while two Rome colleagues spend day enabling the Religious Order seminar.

Contradiction: Finding translators for Regional Consult. (Wk. 4)

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Lis Banks visits Dr. Stuart Kingmar, chief of Christian Medical Commission of World Council of Churches in Geneva, who gives Europe-wide contacts for WHO work; and Julie Thonon (of the old Caracas cadre) assists with WHO from Roche Drug Company at Basel. Max Kruse of Danchurchaid speaks favorably of his recent visit to Bayad. Mrs. Bredde of NORAD reports that the committee studying proposal of over US\$200,000 has become interested in all aspects of ICA methodology.

Internal: After one year of camping, House finally moves into renovated kitchen at ground level.

Contradiction: Resolving scheduling of Copenhagen Regional Consult — the date has to be shifted because of national holiday long week-end. (Wk. 3)

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA**

External: Work in Sangor, the most isolated cluster village, is initiated with women's meeting and men's AEE water-system planning session.

Internal: House space transformation is planned and executed.

Contradiction: Deciding how to split into many teams and maintain adequate expertise per team. (Wk. 3)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: The area LENS team completes LENS planning session with Ghana Peace Corps plus a strategy planning session with 200 Home Scientists at their national conference for a total of \$3000. Ivory Coast Village Development Cluster site is selected with national, regional, and local frame in place for initiation following Regional Consult. In the process, a total of 40 new people are trained as workshop leaders and 26 gain up-front experience of being a leadership team.

Internal: Updated financial records bring the House's finances into corporate focus.

Contradiction: Consolidating corporate structures while facing a major rush of multiple corporate tasks. (Wk. 4)

External: Nine of the twelve Diamond Cluster Villages hold Village Meetings to do pre-Consult vision workshop and allow villages to choose their ten representatives to Week IV Consult. Development team submits nine proposals, updates files, develops K1200, writes thank-you letters and inkind cement and blocks for first of two generator houses.

Internal: Holy week is celebrated with meal conversations over the *Imitation of Christ* and two-day fast followed by House Church feast. Howard and Lyle are sent out to Chicago; and E.G. does first week on HDTS curriculum with Olatowa, including making a very fine garden.

Contradiction: Getting development strategies in line with rate of program expansion. (Wk. 3)\*

Contradiction: Keeping global vision in the local whirlpool. (Wk. 7)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Thirty-five people, representing four metros and a wealth of diversity, gather for South-Eastern Regional Consult and astound everyone with their collegiality and clarity about the world.

Internal: Consult Team, Black Engagement Strategy Team, and Amina Laurel arrive at House, more than doubling numbers.

Contradiction: Expanding teams to increase momentum to bring off Regional Assembly. (Wk. 4)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that across the globe LENS is becoming "the thing to do." Bombay and Hong Kong receive monies after visits with "new" frame. Chicago is bringing in bottom lines slowly but surely. Through Regional Consult contacts the framing of new and old constituencies brings "Hope" for future development. The key contradiction lies in the arena of requiring an imaginal leap to include LENS as a part of fund-raising efforts.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Taiwan HDTS produces six auxiliary for Hai Ou. Liturgy is created in poetry and mood of Chinese, Ursula LeGuin and Carl Sagan. Distribution of *IMAGE* No. 2 on Imaginal Training Methods takes place as it gets in the mail to the Order, 2,000 university libraries, religious orders and churches. Liturgy creation has brought renewed excitement to symbolic life; and P.R. piece has been completed and is at the printer in Bombay. The key contradiction lies in the arena of writing down learnings in publications and talking while the Centrum is scattered into field research of missional engagement.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports programmatic breakthroughs surround and follow the Regional Consults in Hong Kong and Taiwan. Bombay reports registrations arriving for Maliwada HDTI and successful Symposiums in Pune and Calcutta. Nine more Regional Consults are in full swing in North America as core curriculum courses multiply across the continent. The momentum of the Regional Consult has intensified marketing of other events and courses. The key contradiction lies in the arena of enabling necessary images to allow for a powerful summer in the midst of the dynamic and demanding mission of all the regions.

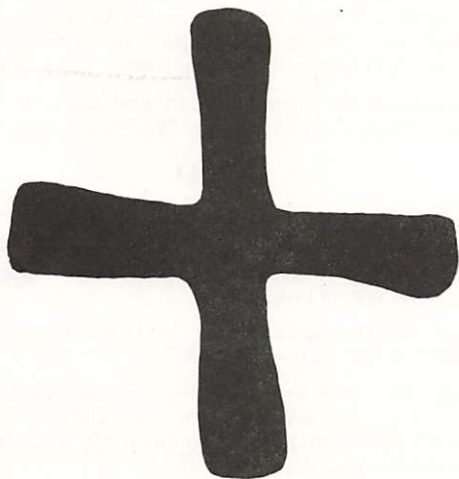
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: Fourth Volunteer Orientation Weekend (V.O.W.) course is held with six new participants; on staff is first returnee Volunteer after four months in Seva Gram.

Internal: Serious house hunt begins with May 31 deadline.

Contradiction: Clearing decks for full-steam ahead on Regional Consult with two-thirds of House in Brussels for Formation Fortnight. (Wk. 4)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Xaverian Fathers say yes to attending Social Methods Course beginning Week 6. Aberdeen University requests film and possible V.O.W. in autumn.

Internal: Collegium room gets coating of paint as House breaks up for Easter discontinuity.

Contradiction: Honoring "urgent tactics" rather than waiting in holding pattern of internal/permeation demands. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Bristol Region delegation to Continental Symposium includes key couple from St. Paul/Bristol and is impacted by practical images of North/South dialogue. Internal: Hosting the Continent as Fortnight and Nexus facilities are reset, staff reflects on global, practical, and spirit implications of Fortnight.

Contradiction: Tying up loose ends and program demands in order to focus Week 10 Order gathering so it will be globally enabling. (Wk. 6)\*

Internal: First interview with large multi-national raises hopes of solving area and house self-support.

Discussion with Professor Jan Tinbergen has far reaching implications for Exposition in India and appropriate role of Amsterdam Region.

Internal: Colleague's life-long wish to visit St. Bavos Cathedral in Gent results in impact on House during stop on the way back from Brussels. Two collegiums on "Consult Reflections" from North America stimulate new images with the Hologram and the patterns of change documentation.

Contradiction: Overcoming resistance to corporateness in a society where the highest honor is held for individualism. (Wk. 6)\*

External: Seminar with the Divine Word Fathers — 45 participants from 14 nations — deals with planning methods. House reaches goal of 20 participants coming from 11 different nations for second religious order seminar. Bishop James Mathews and Fr. Marcel Ranville from Caracas make visits on Vatican congregations and religious orders and visit two cardinals. They have front row seats at Palm Sunday Mass in St. Peter's Square.

Internal: Brochures are mailed for Regional Consult. The youth (one half of Rome House) are sent to Brussels to enable Formation Fortnight while two Rome colleagues spend day enabling the Religious Order seminar.

Contradiction: Finding translators for Regional Consult. (Wk. 4)

### STOCKHOLM

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Regional Consult set-up team visits World Health Organization conference facilities in response to offer by

W.H.O. of the free use of their facilities for Regional Consult Symposium and confirms meeting room, lunch arrangement and production needs for Symposium. W.H.O. also hosts Deputy Minister of Health of German Democratic Republic (East) and asks House to be represented. Circuit team to Jylland breaks open new contacts and secures base of operations in Vejle for Practicum week. Dr. Quigley, working with WHO on Urban Services, agrees to help set up team with background research for Consult.

Internal: After having made it one month at a time so far on employment, a contract for May through August is tied down, putting House in the black. A. Knutsen returns from Brussels Formation Fortnight for final set-up push on Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Tying down loose ends relative to recruitment to ensure broad representation at Symposium. (Wk. 6)\*

### CAIRO

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: House hosts fourteen from Germany. Development receives DM 20,000 with promise of 10,000 more in response to village water system proposal.

Internal: Four ICA staff and two Minia University staff are sent to Formation Fortnight in Brussels.

Contradiction: Assigning troops that assures Bayad local unit demonstration for sake of Beni Suef authorization and maximizes ability to respond to openings from Regional Consult follow-up. (Wk. 5)\*

### ABIDJAN

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Framing meeting with Minister and top leadership of Ghanaian Ministry of Youth and Rural Development further solidifies Avenorpeme Village Development Cluster frame. The villages raise 11,000 Cedis (US\$4,000) for health clinic and 300 bags of fertilizer are delivered to Avenorpeme. In Region Abidjan, the team sets up the Brobo Village Development Cluster leadership training and village meetings.

Internal: New set of collegiums begins count-down to the Regional Consult and Brobo Village Development Cluster initiation.

Contradiction: Accomplishing four weeks of time-line with only two weeks to the Symposium. (Wk. 5)\*

### LAGOS

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Relations with all four sectors intensify as national and state assembly people organize Local Government Area forum sets; broad spectrum of organizations show interest in Symposium; and site visits include 25 people from Adult Education Department of the University of Lagos, 40 people from Nigerian Field Society (mostly expatriate corporation managers), and representatives from ICCO in Holland and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Internal: Easter storms provide refreshing discontinuity, although in the process, blow off many roofs in Ijede and demolish community bus stop and wharf. Saturday investiture of traditional chief of neighboring village followed by Roundtable celebration intensifies corporateness. Conversations with two industry bookkeepers reveal they are ready to join ICA and are now raising and saving money to attend July Council.

Contradiction: Getting off plateau between doing single HDP and doing the systems that enable entire Local Government Area to come off. (Wk. 4)\*

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Nine of the twelve Diamond Cluster Villages hold Village Meetings to do pre-Consult vision workshop and allow villages to choose their ten representatives to Week IV Consult. Development team submits nine proposals, updates files, develops K1200, writes thank-you letters and inkind cement and blocks for first of two generator houses.

Internal: Holy week is celebrated with meal conversations over the *Imitation of Christ* and two-day fast followed by House Church feast. Howard and Lyle are sent out to Chicago; and E.G. does first week on HDTs curriculum with Olalowa, including making a very fine garden.

Contradiction: Getting development strategies in line with rate of program expansion. (Wk. 3)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Last ten days of this quarter see 2,200 people go through training or programs—five Women Advancement Modules, a A.T.I., a V.L.I., two Agriculture Modules, two Health Modules, four health training events, a Cluster Consult, three circuits, and six village meetings, all capped by fantastic project directors meeting. Kenya breweries decide to co-sponsor Symposium, four Practicum luncheons are set up throughout country and World Bank asks Institute to be on the negotiation team for next loan package.

Internal: Nothing and nobody seem to stay more than 24 hours; House welcomes back Rafos's from the States with great reports and assorted goodies including new ICA brochure.

Contradiction: Stretching creativity on maneuvering sufficient resources and troops without spreading ourselves too thin over many programmatic arenas. (Wk. 5)\*

Internal: House holds fine Easter House Church with Kuala Lumpur House and Jim Oberg.

Contradiction: Finding ways to continue servicing the regions and yet do necessary edge brooding. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Board Chairman John Gurusamy and guardian Dr. Arshad Ayab snatch victory from jaws of defeat by producing new major speaker for National Symposium on 24-hours notice — the Minister of Agriculture. Seventeen participate in Symposium workshop leader training. Ford says yes to three cars for Practicum.

Internal: Death and resurrection are an existential experience for House over the Easter weekend, as the Regional Consult preparation drama unfolds. Nexus hosts House for great Easter House Church and egg hunt.

Contradiction: Tightening internal organization and clarifying tasks in order to make maximum use of every available troop and every available minute in final week of Consult preparation. (Wk. 3)

Space transformation is week's highlight as Bubun begins building new community center and tearing down old HDTs building.

Contradiction: Identifying death ground for future in midst of potential bureaucratic slow downs. (Wk. 3)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Regional Consult has 100 people at Symposium from 17 of 23 districts. Head of Parliament stays through for site visit to Bontoa (Tambua Preschool entertained him). Four teams go to seven districts where head officials host teams of ICA, local people from cluster and government officials. At Assembly in

Bontoa district officer closes, saying his hope is that Indonesia will love humanity.

Internal: Staff returns from field trips with Bugis Sarongs and lots of stories. House sends out Terry Fahrenbacher, Gail West, John Epps, Eunice and Robert and P.T. James.

Contradiction: Treading into new arenas illuminated by authorization brought forth by Regional Consult. (Wk. 5)\*

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Development interchange trek to Singapore Nexus results in company breaklooses using contacts from N.E. Asia as well as new data for corporation data system. Korean general LENS with 12 companies and 22 participants draws requests for in-house LENS from several companies. TIME/LIFE LENS brings in \$5,000.

Internal: New comprehensiveness screen enables launch into broodings for future and implications for Summer.

Contradiction: Deciding radical new structures that turn programmatic advantage into new story of mission in the future. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Village involvement in Nam Wai Foundation activities is increased through house-to-house distribution of village planning brief and active discussion by villagers of key Foundation issues at general membership meeting. Two-day traditional Hakka wedding celebration culminates with entire Yau Clan participating in closing feast, part of which is held in community center.

Internal: Bob Sharkey from New York visits Nam Wai on round-the-world trip and solves major internal contradiction by hooking up clothes dryer in middle of rainy season. Celebration of guardian Frank Richards' 50th birthday signifies life of a real iron man.

Contradiction: Creating proper context to broaden government's understanding of ICA role of service in Hong Kong from village development to training in all sectors. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: The first HDTS to be held with the people of China is completed with graduation of 12 people. Each graduate receives a photo of the school participants in their blue shirts and a graduation certificate.

Internal: Following the HDTS, House builds new internal models and does resettlement to incorporate new staff person.

Contradiction: Discerning the over-arching program thrust and assignments that will give motivation and perspective to everyday work. (Wk. 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development returns with best week ever in Seoul, with 41 visits and 18 paid registrations for LENS April 27-29. Regional Consult is launched with great brochure and much affirmation.

Internal: Special Agape Feast continues Holy Week emphasis and Good Friday is opportunity for a day of dialogue with Bell and E.G. creation of *Easter Journey Book*.

Contradiction: Sparking gap between the facts of society's readiness for program and staff's decision to do it, in the midst of watching LENS open up and preparing for Regional Consults. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Carmen co-op store conducts one month inventory with officials, and Luman store receives cigarette consignment. Team organizes Langub road, loading nine truck loads of gravel for maintenance. Internal: House has workday for beautification, and new preschool teacher from the cluster joins the planning.

Houses report more than thirty families interested in hosting Japanese students for next school year.

Internal: Religious House Training Center has a busy week with advisors meeting, Global Language School and a crowded Roundtable.

Contradiction: Bridging the big gap between missional costs and missional income. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Forty visits are made on private sector contacts to recruit participation in Regional Consult. A key tool is the new brochure. Also the host committee gathered with a "few friends" for a breakfast to kick off campaign.

Internal: Jim Oberg is welcomed for an extra hand, and the Song family is sent out for military service.

Contradiction: Keeping all the fires burning—LENS, RS-I and the Regional Consult. (Wk. 3)

Internal: Yosie Telakau gets measles. House celebrates nothing in particular and life in general with lamb feast; folks come home from New Castle and Darwin.

Contradiction: Creating training journey of a national faculty, both cores and house personnel. (Wk. 6)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE**

External: Dubbo workshop "Development in the 80's" is held with four sectors including Department of Decentralization.

Internal: First week this quarter Auxiliary Trio in same locations focus on same events with inkind accommodation in Dubbo.

Contradiction: Discerning next steps which build momentum. (Wk. 5)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Ben Chapman and Esme Park sell High School Assistant Principal and English teacher on CYF. Team finishes first draft of a "public piece" report on Regional Consult.

Internal: Emerging Generation discover the book *Bush Walkabout* and the WA Museum.

Contradiction: Experiencing a fog about methods and strategy for changing lives in the urban at this time. (Wk. 4)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Visiting for Regional Consult brings total visits in last three weeks to 77 as major thrust shifts from Symposium to practical details of the Practicum. Youth bring home good report cards, and Brooke gets initiated into debate team.

Contradiction: Merging implementation and doing into long-range picture by turning verbal yes's into concrete registrations. (Wk. 5)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that this was a week of practical commitment: EEC contract for India Block Project is signed; Sir James and Professor Tinbergen secure support for India Exposition; North American patron assures staff that US\$12,000 is on the way, another sends US\$25,000 and a third sends US\$100,000. Significant patron support with cash and authorization is enabling trend. The key contradiction lies in the arena of turning other commitments into cash by May 31 and June 30 deadlines while building tactics to sustain July momentum.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that John Cock and Howard Stoner join Summer Prep Task Force in Chicago. Chicago Research reports launching of Chicago Area's six edge PSU's, beginning with HDZ in Chicago House. Brussels' evaluation and reflection conversations on Formation Fortnight point to its significance as practical demonstration of multi-cultural, racial and religious unity. Brussels finds annual Guardian event to be a gathering of the larger order while Chicago launches evening reviews of edge books. The key contradiction lies in the arena of keeping the tension between wrapping up the year and doing long-range brooding on things like The Other World as basis for multi-cultural unity.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports support of Regional Consults in Dallas, Jakarta, Seoul, Vancouver, Miami, Lagos, Rochester, Halifax, Phoenix, Sydney and Adelaide. Metro lab interviews discover towns whose achievements since their community forums astound the interviewers. At the same time Academy participants learn community forum methodology. Formation Fortnight format proves replicable as three modules from Training Practicum are ready to go on the road; and Bombay talking papers symbolize serious brooding about the Order's spirit task and future. The key contradiction lies in the arena of bringing off 23 more Regional Consults and orchestrating a complexity of assignment needs with imaginations stretched.

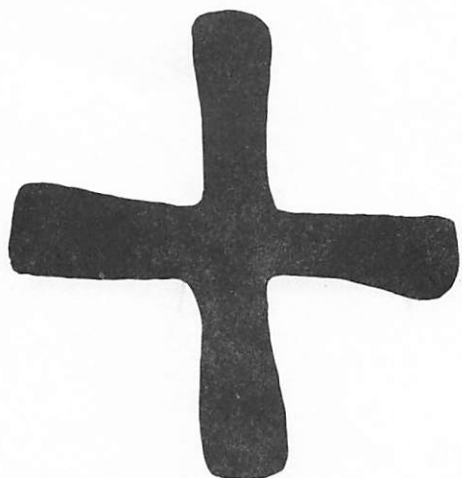
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: Four Paris regional colleagues attend closing of Formation Fortnight in Brussels — the Demonstration Symposium called *The Urban Challenge*. Critical preparation for local program takes step forward with a three-evening *Forum Communautaire* orchestrator training in French.

Internal: Jeff and Jean Baptiste return from three and a half weeks in Brussels. Edith lands new temporary work contract with O.E.C.D. for seven weeks, giving self-support a boost.

Contradiction: Creating clear realistic tactics that care for all strategies from now until quarter's end in midst of a continually changing universe. (Wk. 6)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: EEC Grant for \$140,000 for India Block Project is signed and due in hand imminently.

Internal: Hosting the Continent as Fortnight and Nexus facilities are reset, staff reflects on global, practical, and spirit implications of Fortnight.

Contradiction: Tying up loose ends and program demands in order to focus Week 10 Order gathering so it will be globally enabling. (Wk. 6)

Internal: House disperses again with Paul to Amsterdam and Paige to Abidjan and Lagos as Regional Consults globally command care. Herman and Lieve Heylans prepare to intern in London House.

Contradiction: Meeting "urban challenge" theme of Fortnight out of long-range as well as immediate and symbolic actions. (Wk. 6)\*

**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: *Launching Public Declaration* intent from Regional Consult gets intensified through a Declaration PSU held during week including four colleagues involved in German TV, art teaching and public relations. Twenty-two people attend Formation Fortnight from Areas Frankfurt and Budapest. Ludwigshafen circuit allows core to meet and plan toward an event to bring together people who have worked with the ICA across the city.

Internal: Final guest room renovation in House enables Regional Consult team to be under one roof.

Contradiction: Discerning long-term advantages for Movement which can be capitalized on by the Regional Consult. (Wk. 7)\*

**CAIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA**

External: House hosts fourteen from Germany. Development receives DM 20,000 with promise of 10,000 more in response to village water system proposal.

Internal: Four ICA staff and two Minia University staff are sent to Formation Fortnight in Brussels.

Contradiction: Assigning troops that assures Bayad local unit demonstration for sake of Beni Suef authorization and maximizes ability to respond to openings from Regional Consult follow-up. (Wk. 5)

**ABIDJAN****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Framing meeting with Minister and top leadership of Ghanaian Ministry of Youth and Rural Development further solidifies Avenorpeme Village Development Cluster frame. The villages raise 11,000 Cedis (US\$4,000) for health clinic and 300 bags of fertilizer are delivered to Avenorpeme. In Region Abidjan, the team sets up the Brobo Village Development Cluster leadership training and village meetings.

Internal: New set of collegiums begins count-down to the Regional Consult and Brobo Village Development Cluster initiation.

Contradiction: Accomplishing four weeks of time-line with only two weeks to the Symposium. (Wk. 5)

**LAGOS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Relations with all four sectors intensify as national and state assembly people organize Local Government Area forum sets; broad spectrum of organizations show interest in Symposium; and site visits include 25 people from Adult Education Department of the University of Lagos, 40 people from Nigerian Field Society (mostly expatriate corporation managers), and representatives from ICCO in Holland and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Support of modules continues to increase with 300 Mugomini women at Women's Advancement Module. First monthly donation (10,000 plus food supplies) for Health Training Module.

Internal: First of six volunteers arrives from Cleveland and London causing flurry of repairs and room re-arranging. House focuses on July program with Spirit Edge Collegium and discussions over implications of new council design.

Contradiction: Releasing structural engagement in all programs while providing back-up systems to sustain it. (Wk. 6)\*

Contradiction: Demonstrating hope in a time of watching and waiting in midst of fear of the future manifesting itself as fatalism. (Wk. 6)

Woburn Lawn holds powerful CEM during Practicum week with celebration for 300 people including Minister of Youth and Community Development. Many new colleagues emerge and a four-sector delegation to July Council in Chicago begins to take shape.

Internal: House "does the nation" through National Consultation, hosts global team, celebrates after Consult at the Courtleigh Manor Hotel and re-configures for House Church in Woburn Lawn.

Contradiction: Building catalytic strategy which will enable National Strategy to be implemented by the four sectors. (Wk. 6)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Forty-five participants representing five nations and four regions in Area Lima complete three-week Community Reformulation Laboratory. Guardians join participants and Azpitia villagers to celebrate closing of school.

Internal: Continental faculty completes evaluation and documentation of school experience, seeing it as effective and flexible tool for creating teams of local people concerned with Human Development. House welcomes sojourners from Patevilca, Peru, Sol de Septiembre, Chile, and Barlovento, Venezuela.

Contradiction: Projecting action into coming year to close gap in missional vision. (Wk. 7)\*

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

Internal: Charles Lingo's surprise visit provides auxiliary with welcome opportunity to think through strategic next steps for summer transition period.

Contradiction: Gaining perspective on next six months which informs necessary maneuvers. (Wk. 6)\*

## **BUENOS AIRES**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Conserving Industry sells 4,500 pesos worth of products at Institute for Rehabilitation of Handicapped Children. Best ever visit with Mayor of Lampa county focuses on Sol's accomplishments and and current needs. Catholic Relief Services receive three proposals per their request.

Internal: House celebrates Kelly's upcoming trip to Guatemala for three back-to-back LENS courses with magnificent beefsteak, chicken and wine dinner out in Lampa.

Contradiction: Being and doing sign of hope in midst of everything suggesting no hope. (Wk. 6)\*

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: House receives inkind office equipment and furniture as well as inkind VW "Brasilia" car—great asset to enlarging fleet. Quarter planning continues with special emphasis on Bananeiras.

Internal: Event of week is publication of Regional Consult document. Wanjico Rosario celebrates her seventh birthday.

Contradiction: Renewing House spirit in midst of ever increasing victories. (Wk. 6)\*

## **GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM**

Global Development Centrum reports this is last week of Annual Report copy writing and editing in Chicago. German Church group takes US\$10,000 to El Bayad. Great Codel site visit is paid to Chikhale. Staff continue to meet funding opportunities, training and program implementation in same companies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of having only one month to the monsoon and money urgently needed to complete fire instruction-type projects before the rains begin.

## **GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM**

Global Research Centrum reports a week focused on interchange and reflection in preparation for the Global Council in July. Work in Chicago focused on preparation for the try-out of a retreat construct at Area Houston meeting and on sending a recommended report form in the packet for regions to use and bring in July. The focus shifts to wrapping up the year and putting the work of research into final form as input for the Global Council. The key contradiction lies in the arena of anticipating the summer so that Research's input is prepared in appropriate form.

## **GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM**

Global Operations Centrum reports that Seoul Symposium brings together four sectors for a great Regional Consult launch. London Consult begins. Seattle, Calcutta, Pune and Jawale Cluster Consults are completed. Document team puts Bombay and Chikhale documents to press, publish Roundtable and House reports for Sub-Asia. In Bombay, major offers for training rural development workers in multi-village cluster for UNICEF indicate need to pull training schemes together. Hong Kong regional task force holds demonstration Town Meeting in preparation for YMCA forum. The key contradiction lies in the arena of adequate documentation of Regional Consult and Formation Fortnight activity while focussing on the July Council.

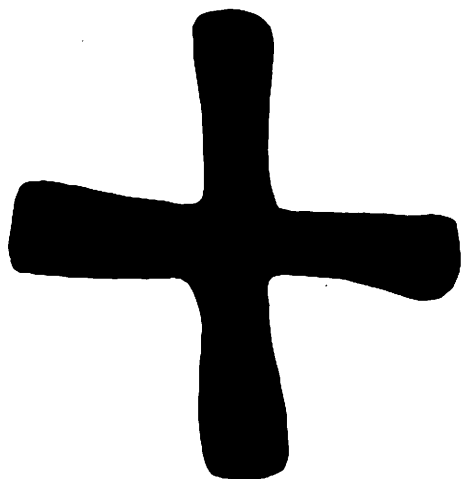
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

Bartolome de Vicens visits with his superior to lay initial groundwork for a planning session and methods training for Dominican Order's Annual Conference of eastern Spain province. Development team from Brussels receives favorable responses from several multi-nationals.

Internal: A celebrative week of a growing House, Alerdings return from two-week trek to Portugal and Development team arrives from Brussels. House celebrates Feast of San Isidro (patron saint of Madrid) with dinner out at Lobera family home, rehearsing story and excitement of Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Picking up on momentum from Regional Consult and getting implementing tactics initiated before summer solstice sets in. (Wk. 7)\*

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Reflecting the entire year, this week is one of broadening contacts, re-engaging historic colleagues and strengthening the Movement's grasp of its role — all in preparation for Regional Consult.

Internal: With return of six members from Brussels Fortnight, life regains normality for the E.G. and work for Regional Consult is restored with immense vigour.

Contradiction: Living out of realised victory of the next four years rather than frenzy of last minute Consult set-up. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Xaverian Fathers and a Church of Scotland minister attend first Social Methods event and immediately declare these tools as relevant to their work. During the week

one participant calls to say she has invited friends for other sessions.

Contradiction: Cranking up appropriate "event-filledness" before summer "lull" sets in. (Wk. 6)

Contradiction: Creating clear realistic tactics that care for all strategies from now until quarter's end in midst of a continually changing universe. (Wk. 6)

Contradiction: Keeping image of Regional Consult before House amidst day to day abundance of bread and butter issues. (Wk. 8)\*

External: Team completes translation of Regional Consult document. Development circuit in Frankfurt Region pulls together several years of development contact history to decide on new focus for the future. Contradiction: Forging models and consensus for doing both Kapini and circuits. (Wk. 6)

External: Cluster circuit experiment begins as team visits four Sub-Location Village Leadership Institute graduates who greet circuiters with "This is what we've done" and "What can we do next?" Four-sector authorization and support are strengthened through Women's Advancement Module (W.A.M.) evaluation and second LENS set up with Cotton Co-operative in Western Providence. Mailing to 300 announces Regional Consult with professionally designed brochure and Kenya Voice No. 4 on new village progress.

Internal: Feeling global demands and support, House sends out David Coffman to Zambia and receives Affa Chapman from Cleveland, and holds tremendous shiskabob celebrative dinner. Kay Hayes and Karen Raschke are assigned to hospital.

Internal: East coast and West coast meet in Houston as Jim Wiegel and Phoebe Reynolds arrive to orchestrate Consult and bring new eyes to view Houston Region; picnic at Johnson Space Center celebrates the blast-off of Consult and successful insertion into orbit of Symposium. Shirley Henschen is elected "employee of the month" with huge plaque and bonus. Two of Claire Clement's dances are selected for presentation to whole school at the senior recital on May 5.

Contradiction: Circuiters go out door asking "What is a Metro Practicum anyway?" (Wk. 5)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: House sends out letter to colleagues describing opportunities for summer training events, including an RS-I and Global Council. Regional team sends out letter and questionnaire to up-date Alabama documentation. Team

creates maneuver plan to raise \$26,000 for program support, accompanied by Week II prayer ritual.

Internal: House welcomes guest Christine Brewer, Executive Secretary of the National Office of United Methodist Church Home Missions Program.

Contradiction: Creating a common story that enables completion of circuit maneuvers so as to get on the road. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Weekend PSU polishes document and sends it to typist. DHHR representative visits Charity Hospital Quality Work Life Team to see about expansion to other state agencies. Grace Day Care staff pushes Imaginal Education curriculum to new depth in third week of ICA Imaginal Education Consultation.

Internal: The week is filled to overflowing with a Memorial Day picnic, a new baby—Nicole Lynette Westre, a collegium on the Order journey pulled through India, and a Week II of great expenditure painting the windows on the residential floors in preparation for energy-conserving storm windows.

Contradiction: Creating access to the "global mind" by filling gaps in data and communication. (Wk. 9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO**

External: Community Service Forum with Archdiocese of Chicago and Mini-LENS with Custer High school staff initiate focus on program marketing. 5th City Business Careers begins teaching computer curriculum. Bethany Hospital breaks ground for new hospital on 3444 campus.

Internal: Celebrative week with two birthdays, one graduation and annual Memorial Day Picnic at the Ayres provides fantastic interlude for House.

Contradiction: Discerning clear images of next steps for formulating metro colleague engagement by Fall. (Wk. 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Regional "inner circle" list of 100 is completely computerized in-house with personalized letter capability.

Internal: Rhoda Ertle visits for ten days and House has in-depth corporate look at next year through collegium on assignments.

Contradiction: Setting aside time from interviewing to set appointments for interviews of people beyond immediate circle. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR**

External: Team sets up and completes two-week 40-church Development trek and completes over 100 Consult interviews. University of Iowa graduate student begins video-tape report on Lorimor. Twenty-five Lorimor businesses launch a shop-at-home campaign.

Internal: House sends two to Minneapolis for advanced LENS training.

Contradiction: Creating solid Symposium recruitment plan. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: House and metro host advanced LENS training for 25 individuals, rehearsing historical ground and journey of LENS and giving participants tools to facilitate and market LENS. Upper Midwest Indian Center holds LENS PSU, cementing partnership in key sphere.

Internal: House focuses internally on preparation for advanced LENS training and the image of "The Flight of the Revolutionary Cuckoo".

Contradiction: Synchronizing global year-to-year operation with regional on-going program, and recovering lost and forgotten networks. (Wk. 7)

Internal: Margaret and Matthew Kraus from Lorimor hold down command post during Metro Practicum. Consult expands regional team, covering all metros.

Contradiction: Objectifying already full sense of Regional Consult accomplishment in face of unformed data and stories. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Team completes Collinwood Neighborhood Input Meeting series and Gahanne Town Meeting. One-day Imaginal Education Leadership Lab for colleagues in Cleveland paves way for future work with education arena in Metro.

Internal: People in House jump from three to ten between dinner and breakfast as representatives of three centrums arrive for Imaginal Education Lab and special regional development effort. House celebrates at Greek Festival and Dance after Spring cleaning and getting all cars operating.

Contradiction: Maintaining circuit rhythm in the midst of special opportunities and training people rapidly for new forms of structural engagement. (Wk. 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Week of development nets \$1,000 in hand, \$600 committed, \$6,500 working and catalyzes activation of South Bend, Indiana Polis.

Internal: House youth is honored for participation in High School Band and for being one of High School Prom Chairpersons.

Contradiction: Objectifying and weaving together covenants of metro colleagues to assure Quarter IV victories. (Wk. 7)

### **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Six people attend two-day site visit and briefing on City Ventures in Minnesota—three from House and three from region. Invitations are extended for work in Tri-Cities and Loisaia.

Internal: House secures architects' and contractor's estimates on repairing new facility.

Contradiction: Living with *the no longer* and *the not yet*. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN**

External: ICA Volunteers, Widen residents and humanities scholars complete seventh presentation of the Story of Human Development in rural communities across West Virginia. Widen resident Stanley Keen places sixth in state-wide Banjo Contest held in Charleston.

Internal: Whole House gets together for Memorial Day Celebration at Vandalia Gathering (a country music and crafts fair) in Charleston, receives back John Linstrom and sends out Elaine Stover as House members have now orchestrated four Regional Consults.

Contradiction: Transferring long-range vision of Consult into implementation tactics for this week amidst numerous uncertainties and tendencies toward tentativeness. (Wk. 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Regional Directions Conference brings together new initiates, re-engaged colleagues and old hands in hard-working session, full of lusty singing and great celebration. "*The Region hasn't had such an event since the Golding,*" an old hand is heard to say.

Internal: Voted style spin sparks conversation on how to stand in face of human struggle.

Contradiction: Walking slowly and intentionally into the '80s, pacing regional team for The Long March. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: People involved with Living Room Dialogue come to Evening at the Institute and respond to global presentation by volunteering to do development and engage in methods training.

Internal: Quarter IV internal planning recreates House sense of time as grounding in the Word continues with story section of "*Christ of History*" paper.

Contradiction: Demonstrating hope in a time of watching and waiting in midst of fear of the future manifesting itself as fatalism. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.**

External: Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone commits \$500 for Consult scholarship. Ivy City residents and advisors plan trek to Chicago and to Minneapolis to visit Training, Inc., Control Data and City Venture projects.

Internal: Collegium on role of the sectors clarifies unclarity and gives permission to create.

Contradiction: Covering region comprehensively as well as strategically. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Work is done in three states as Evenings with the Institute happen in Laconia, New Hampshire, and Martha's Vineyard, Maine, enlivening distant relationships and setting stage for program next year. Week II in Starks prepares section of Cornshop for rented warehouse space. "Brick Steamer" pottery business prepares to open.

Internal: Additional boarder is secured for June/July—clerk of the Presbytery from West Collingswood, New Jersey—in town for graduate theological course. Celtics win 14th NBA championship providing celebration in midst of threatened school closings and layoffs.

Contradiction: Determining best way to care for five people from region about to finish the Academy. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS**

External: Starks residents continue push on community improvement in May through fourth Saturday workday and day-long participation in ACCION (Micro-Enterprise Development Corporation) sponsored workshop. House acts as consultant for Rural Venture sheep farming project in New Hampshire, agency forum in Bangor and agency guild in Augusta. Colleagues and contacts emerge from global film showing to church youth group, participation in two Hunger Project events and a meeting with a Maine state representative.

Internal: House celebrates with post-workday movies at Starks residents' home, and hosts the Rev. George Moore family and members of church youth group for workday. Reflection on death of fourth hunger striker in Northern Ireland and first planting of house garden on Fast Day impact House.

Contradiction: Struggling to find the breakthrough rather than predisposing to keep on keeping on. (Wk. 8)\*

### **MONTREAL**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Development team swirls grassroots and private sector with set-up of 160 corporation blitz, film show and key visits to Birks Foundation and National Chamber of Commerce.

Internal: Roundtable builds movemental collegiality with Ruth Linstead, President of Business and Professional Women's Club of Montreal, and continues training journey of Marsha Sylvia who leads study.

Contradiction: Sustaining program set-up and colleague nurture during summer despite fragmented time/troop design. (Wk. 9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Twelve issues and ten mandates for southern Ontario are consensed on by 130 delegates with solid cross-sector input. One thousand follow-up Assembly brochures are mailed, reporting on Symposium and launching four-week Particum. Two days of calling on Symposium participants and

old contacts produces LENS with United Church high-rise apartments and sets LENS date for Massey-Ferguson top executives.

Internal: Five from Area New York come to Symposium symbolising decision to work region to region. Ted Farrar turns 40 during Symposium (but not as a result of it). Everyone enjoys strategy weekend in hotel.

Contradiction: Needing to meet program demand in midst of no set long-term strategy. (Wk. 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Travelling 10,000 Km. (88 trips) to visit 31 communities and talking with 328 people makes *The Ottawa Valley Potential: Dialogue* a household word in Renfrew and Pontiac Counties. Follow-up calls assure 35 committed and five registered for Symposium, three scheduled Field Visits in key locations, and commitments for Assembly attendance.

Internal: House celebrates 32nd anniversary of ordination into Christian Ministry for George Yost. House experiences Emerging Generation dynamic with Mira Fisher and Brian as part of House dynamic.

Contradiction: Weaving together concern for quality in Regional Consult event with quantity of participation so that impact reaches well into future. (Wk. 7)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX**

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: The Governor drops in with delegation of government officials to show off Conacaste, coinciding with first harvest of bumper tomato crop on Demonstration Farm. Inkind-Development produce 200 papaya trees, paint, 300 bags of cement, vegetable sacks, coffee and \$500 for various programs of the Project.

Internal: House sends out Kim and John Smith, of the Peace Corps, to New Guinea assignment after one month of engagement in Conacaste. Ice cream and fluffy egg cake at House Church mark transition of Juana Neriquita to Phase III; chicken adobo and chilled wine luncheon completes great birthday celebration.

Contradiction: Webbing several related social structures into solid task forces that realize victories. (Wk. 6)\*

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: "Jamaican Potential" is held April 24 to May 1 with 100 participants from the four sectors at Symposium, 1300 people interviewed and in the forums during the Practicum and 75 people in the Assembly from all 14 Parishes of the nation. Consult follow-up begins immediately with frame visits, document production and forum set-up. Woburn Lawn holds powerful CEM during Practicum week with celebration for 300 people including Minister of Youth and Community Development. Many new colleagues emerge and a four-sector delegation to July Council in Chicago begins to take shape.

Internal: House "does the nation" through National Consultation, hosts global team, celebrates after Consult at the Courtleigh Manor Hotel and re-configures for House Church in Woburn Lawn.

Contradiction: Building catalytic strategy which will enable National Strategy to be implemented by the four sectors. (Wk. 6)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Forty-five participants representing five nations and four regions in Area Lima complete three-week Community Reformulation Laboratory. Guardians join participants and Azpitia villagers to celebrate closing of school.

Internal: Continental faculty completes evaluation and documentation of school experience, seeing it as effective and flexible tool for creating teams of local people concerned with Human Development. House welcomes sojourners from Patevilca, Peru, Sol de Septiembre, Chile, and Barlovento, Venezuela.

Contradiction: Projecting action into coming year to close gap in missional vision. (Wk. 7)

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Amidst diminished forces, team visits all ten cluster villages. New village holds its follow-up Foro meeting with 30 present. Staff hold two English classes in Juan Diaz and Mendoza, and Ecclesiola in Cano Negro. YMCA decides to do sport programs in the ten cluster villages.

Internal: Cathy is offered a job through the Ministry of Agriculture and Animal-Raising to teach English to agronomists working in Barlovento.

Contradiction: Discerning time/troop rhythm to complete Training Center and intensify programmatic action in order to move strategically into summer. (Wk. 7)\*

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Pfizer donates two boxes of medicines to Sol. *Paroquia Universitaria* group (graduates and students) join Community Board Meeting to offer their services in various fields to community. Commission to bring off Sol's third anniversary in June holds its first meeting with great excitement and animation.

Internal: House watches movie "Tora, Tora, Tora" on TV for two evenings—an impacting perspective.

Contradiction: Discerning key steps toward necessary new future in midst of so many important and good ideas. (Wk. 7)\*

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Local government and state officials participate in set-up of Community Forums in municipality of Rio Bonito. Brazilian corporate president gets excited over municipal plan and wants to donate time and money.

Internal: House sends out Phyllis, Tina and John Slicker, and holds birthday celebrations for Kalolo Rosario and Eric Brown. Brazilian corporation gives inkind office equipment and furniture to House.

Contradiction: Creating new eventfulness in small communities while training and journeying new regional colleagues. (Wk. 7)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports this is last week of Annual Report copy writing and editing in Chicago. German Church group takes US\$10,000 to El Bayad. Great Codel site visit is paid to Chikhale. Staff continue to meet funding opportunities, training and program implementation in same companies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of having only one month to the monsoon and money urgently needed to complete fire instruction-type projects before the rains begin.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Structural Permeation Labs get another push with Lorimor RVI PSU and the form created for final lab reports. The rough draft of *IMAGE* No. 3 on Demonstration Methods is done. *SEAPAC Soundings* is mailed. The "Five Great Talks" are being done in several Nexus locations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the story behind the HDP facts in the files and documentation.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the Bubun Village Development design is completed. In Chicago, Academy staff completes collation of latest teaching guides for each course in the curriculum. Chicago Nexus and Chicago Region cooperate in a six-state conference of 126 towns for Community Action Program/Community Services Agency. The breakthrough in this is that ICA now has a conference package for participatory decision-making from the bottom up. The key contradiction lies in the arena of inventing the imagery and activity that will keep open the channels of commitment among the newly discovered regional teams.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Mike Hoff is sent to Jakarta to close deal on AID rewrite. A major project of preparing the residential floors of the International Training Center for new energy-conserving storm windows is begun by a Week II task force opening, priming and painting windows. Singapore Nexus orchestrates two audits and launches Management modules to six houses. The key contradiction lies in the arena of filling the cracks in Management so that essential items do not fall through in transition to July structures.
