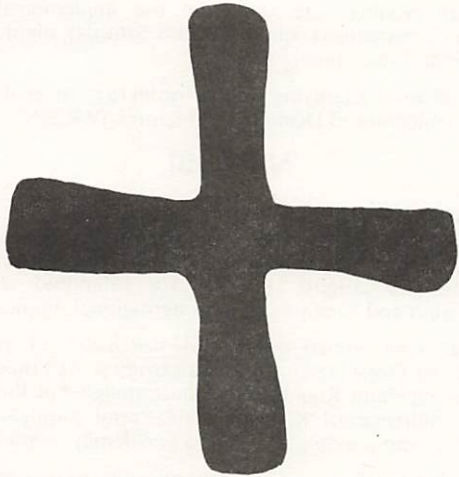

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Visit to UNIVAC results in offer of free computer time. The invitation for Area Council is completed. House receives confirmation of ICA participation in National Conference on Community Development.

Internal: House creates marvelous celebration to send out Patricia Allan, Ann and Jane St. John to Frankfurt.

Contradiction: Securing all fronts before discontinuity begins for House. (Wk. 3)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Another successful guest night continues the drive for an in-depth regional frame. Mini-circuit to Manchester Region is sent forth. International Voluntary Service (a long established voluntary agency) begins sending potential volunteers to ICA for placement interviews.

Internal: A 16-hour sustained attack on a peeling, moldy hallway wall produces great upgrading of house appearance and a corporate sigh of relief. Ellen Riskey is sent out after five-week visit.

Contradiction: Maintaining full force in facility search maneuver. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional team receives queries and interest for future participation from Paris, Peru and Edinburgh.

Internal: House sends out Michael for four-day discontinuity while Mary holds down the fort and visits Stirling Castle.

Contradiction: Utilizing time effectively around permeation. (Wk. 4)*

External: Local parish canon introduces the regional team to Rotary network in Penarth (near House location). Week II

Internal: Work on regional card file prepares data for next regional mailing and regular metro circuits.

Contradiction: Building a movement from scattered and isolated colleagues. (Wk. 4)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Berthold Swaiger and Robert Rank visit and are sent out with six others to Global Council. Development circuits continue in full swing.

Internal: Ruth Dickinson moves in to sojourn for Quarter I, and Canadian Embassy English teaching job is secured for August. House launches Quarter I by attending *Ommegang*—three-hour long 450-year-old pageant — held in Grand Place of Brussels.

Contradiction: Holding dynamics of external missional work in midst of rich corporate and Wayside Inn life. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Brugge-West Flanders Economic Development Council holds closing celebration for 15 Indonesian government employees and praises ICA training as key to nine-month course. Commitment is made for retreat next spring (\$1500). Two more conversations on Global Council participation raise hopes for "seriously considering".

Internal: House has truly awesome final celebration in House office with avocados, beef, champagne, Mozart, Lao-Tse and silence that radiates effulgence.

Contradiction: Regional Consult report awaits French and Flemish translations to move while *the iron is hot*. (Wk. 1)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: House finalizes the 25-year history translation after one year with ten people's involvement. Regional team does first Quarter I circuit and engages in a lot of office clearing and (long-postponed) essential letter writing.

Internal: As first campers and additional staff arrive, the inkind results of food, drinks and sand start rolling in for *Camp MIDDLE EARTH*.

Contradiction: Maintaining chastity for external mission while camp offers tempting opportunities for engagement. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Gifts totaling 600 guilders arrive for the GOC travel fund. Next step is taken in urban research with an "Utrecht Trek" to investigate the various styles of urban neighborhoods in that city.

Internal: Summer renewal dynamic begins with scrubbing and waxing of whole House on fasting day and continues through week with spirit-renewing beach trip, topped off with decor workshop and Profound Humanness montage creation.

Contradiction: Being consumed by the ambiguities of who we are and what needs to be created in Quarter I. (Wk. 3)

Internal: House celebrates *Sanct Hans Day* with a traditional bonfire (and clears all burnable material from property!).

Contradiction: Getting clarity about how far to go with long-term Structural Permeation. (Wk. 1)

External: Men of Sheik Ali organize all-night workday to finish pipeline without knowledge of ICA.

Internal: House sends out Alex Neill after one year of volunteer work on the Bayad Cluster water program.

Contradiction: Meshing discontinuity with accelerating programs so that momentum is not lost. (Wk. 5)*

External: Week-long Health Caretaker training for 12 villages and Kapini is conducted by Chainama Training Center. Auxiliary and Kapini staff provide leadership opportunity and training through *The Team*, and the week comes off as a fine event. Kapini Evaluation Officers for Ford Foundation Grant begin work. In Diamond Villages the welfare building bricks are being made, with 400 completed in Mwachilwana.

Internal: Evenings are spent on the implementaries of Quarter I maneuvers, ending with a Saturday night special bonfire and story-telling time.

Contradiction: Clarifying vision in order to move on the practical enablement of Diamond and Kapini. (Wk. 3)*

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Seven sector meetings reveal the movement is moving during July. Circuit sets up two Village Leadership Institutes for August. Reports are submitted to Ford Foundation and Family Planning International Agency.

Internal: Fine Indian meal and discussion of recently completed Organization of African Unity (OAU) meeting in Nairobi highlight Roundtable. House delights in the grass-roots' influence of Kenya on area prior family as they announce the pending arrival of a new family member.

Contradiction: Focusing strategic priorities to maximize the corporate impact. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Arrival of E.E.C. money from Brussels augments local development efforts. Operations forces continue impact training and HDC courses in Maliwada, Jawale and Chikhale Ashrams.

Internal: Downtown Management office gets much-needed facelift in Week II space blitz and new E.G. space is created in former men's dorm. Roundtable highlights week with two visiting colleagues hosting and with three guests present.

Contradiction: Finding ways to cut across centrum structures to enable the effective engagement of everyone in getting the task done. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Surprise visit by Sub-Collector brings promise of a stall at Jogipet market for Nadlapur vegetables and commerce (general store). Villagers dig 75 pits in anticipation of fruit tree and beautification planting while documentation of Circle Survey and Town Meetings is finished. Thirteen villagers meet for next step of initiating poultry farms while 11 pairs of bullocks arrive from bank loan.

Internal: Collegium, witness and hosting in morning are imaged as training dynamics; assignments by team for members doing daily enablement help create teamhood, and collegiums on decor, house equipment and utensils enable corporateness and deeper understanding of internal life dynamics.

Contradiction: Finding ways to release people's images beyond that of immediacy — busy planting season. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Datuk Seri Dr. Mahathir is enstated as Malaysia's fourth Prime Minister and calls back into being the Ministry of National and Rural Development — a step which greatly influences the direction of programmatic activity. Kuala Selangor District LENS documents and check arrive by hand courier. A trip to Sungai Lui reveals Sewing Industry is underway with 18 electric machines and a contract for 1000 army uniforms. Unanticipated affirmation of Esso LENS proposal occurs when radio and newspapers unexpectedly announce Trengganu State Economic Planning Unit's intention to employ ICA in multi-million dollar rural development scheme.

Internal: After slight delay, newest regional team member, Michaela Rose Welch, arrives 16 July — 6 lbs. 5 oz. and beautiful. Colleague Rochmat Djatmiko comes from Egypt enroute to Indonesia and the Jennings-Teats spend a brief 15 hours on way to Bangkok.

Contradiction: Calling forth creativity in dealing with current, non-grandious, but significant tasks. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Bubun prepares for Muslim Hari Raya (celebration ending month of fasting) by painting 70% of houses and by initiating housing subsidy for poor families. The sixth and last cluster village begins village electricity system. District (Kecamatan) Demonstration circuits assist six new village preschools with equipment purchase and Nestle's inkind visit secures preschool milk. Health module preparation continues with local doctor telling villages that their preschool and self-supporting parents groups will be key for health implementation. Bubun's three water catchment tanks are completed as models.

Internal: House completes Kazanzakis *Saviours of God* study, finding new poetry to talk about being the religious in a multi-religious staff.

Contradiction: Turning USAID's story about Bubun from failure to success as they come to visit again. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: One hundred twenty Idul Fitri cards are sent to region. Dorothy Husky from the University of Texas introduces team to Dr. Samedi, training and extension agent for the Indonesian Department of Agriculture. Sabang office closes after five years.

Internal: Second inkind victory for Quarter I is 100 liters of paint for new residence/training center. Neni drops in and agrees to go on Kelapa Dua circuit.

Contradiction: Discerning practical tasks that will engage regional colleagues during Quarter I. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Forty residents from the six cluster villages gather in Marana after nightly prayers for *desa* (group of villages) Koran reading contest. District Officer comes unexpectedly to "organize" contest and sees *Desa Marannu* is already organized. Fifteen preschool teachers come to Bontoa for training with new curriculum manual. New village generator starts and the public TV moves inside the Community Center.

Internal: Unseasonable rains keep everything green but waterlog the cash crops.

Contradiction: Preparing for August module and *desa* activities before and after Islamic holiday. (Wk. 3)*

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Corrections are completed on Multi-National Corporation Data Listing with 11 nations now on computer. Commitment for 1981-82 is received from Dow Chemical (\$3000) for Philippines, and \$1000 check arrives from BAT for Hong Kong.

Internal: Discontinuous weekly time design is marked by English and Cantonese collegiums, beach barbecue and painting of collegium room and lounge.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the million little things to ensure that the few major things are done. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: First week of Summer Youth Program begins with four days of activities in Hai Ou including indoor and outdoor games, cycling trip, lessons on traffic safety and sanitation, singing and folk dancing. Up to 70 youth participate on a single day and the program is conducted totally by Chinese staff and volunteers.

Internal: Four sojourners join the House to staff the Summer Youth Program. Sally Emerick returns from America.

Contradiction: Finding continuous ways to assign staff leadership roles that are viable and also challenging. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: A family in Bagong Dalan Human Development Project decide to give facility for new village Health Clinic after seeing what is happening in their community. Children in Subtonggan are fascinated with the different colored tires in the newly renovated playground; renovation took two days with visits of the manager of Goodyear Company. Workdays are scheduled in preparation for the first Economic Fair on the island.

Internal: House decides to have two workdays for two hours in a week by getting up at 5:00 in the morning to music and the ringing of the bell as a signal to go to the vegetable farm and help the Economic Team in their new venture. House celebrates the birthdays of Martin and Kristianne together.

Contradiction: Working in five arenas with less expense and different tasks but maintaining the group's momentum. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Cluster distributes envelopes for first canvassing for Preschool Festival and works on Faith Garden. Langub and Luman HDPs receive the remainder of 541 bagrass seedlings from Lapanday.

Internal: Staff plants flowers in front of House.

Contradiction: Seeking vegetable seeds for Faith Garden. (Wk. 4)*

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Development continues in Quarter I with receipt of 100,000 yen from the Conventuals Religious Order, symbolizing their strong collegueship.

Internal: The House is full again although this month has been a game of "musical rooms" with all the comings and goings, and cleaning is key.

Contradiction: Answering the paralyzing question of what is the training required in the House, the area and the region. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Development continues to provide seed money for the rapid beginnings of the new Chungwon Cluster. One million Won (US\$2,000) from Tae Han Bulk Terminal and US\$1,000 from Xerox provide a good start.

Internal: A five-day, 9 to 5 time design is experimented with for the Global Language School, journeying 11 women participants to see themselves as creators of the future.

Contradiction: Finding new troops to do work previously done by those now assigned to Chung Won Cluster. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOH DU E RI

External: Students from five universities and three preschool teachers, all members of U. Am. Presbyterian Church in Cheongju City, invest first week of summer vacation working in Cheongwon Cluster; the preschool is opened in Ho Jeong I Re, and workdays in all four villages accomplish community priorities including cleaning the Shrine of Shin Chae Ho in anticipation of the scholar-hero's 100-year birth celebration. So many women participate in the women's meetings that the village chief, Moon Pak Ri says it is the largest women's meeting in the 900-year history of the village. The church also catalyzes participation of two dentists who see 25 people from three villages, pulling teeth which would have cost US\$300 in clinics.

Internal: Miss Oh Hae Sook and Mrs. Min (Kim Seong Hee) strengthen the leadership team and help bring off the miracles of the Student Encounter week in which the New Religious Mode helps everyone's journey.

Contradiction: Utilizing the many possibilities and resources which are appearing in order to prepare this cluster to care for clusters across the nation. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: LENS site is secured at Park Hotel in Hakata for February LENS Symposium, and LENS calls continue in Fukuoka City. Team holds Training Module on Community Analysis. Colleagues lead Roundtable using "The New Worker" from *The Third Wave*.

Internal: House hosts Mr. Karikoski and Aja from Tokyo with two guests from Finland who arrive in time to attend the Yamagasa Festival at Kushida Shire; this festival originated in the 13th Century to drive away an epidemic and today is a major festival in which young men carry beautifully decorated floats in a race through Hakata.

Contradiction: Following through on new openings in business community and local government. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Friday Night at the Institute meeting finishes a 13-week study on *Third World Development and Freedom* by Soejita Kinoko. Regional team experiences Japan's celebration of a year ending by attending several traditional neighborhood and community celebrations adorned in the traditional Yukata costume.

Internal: House celebrates important decisions of two colleagues as Hiromi Hikosaka, a long-time volunteer who has been studying in Egypt this year, returns to Osaka to announce her decision to marry and as Kenji Yoneda decides to intern with ICA Osaka in August.

Contradiction: Being the demonstration that calls forth the engagement of others and ourselves. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Six-month plan with charts and timeline is completed. LENS grad, Prof. Iida, from Hokkaido University and a member of the Hokkaido Development Board, meets

with Yubari Planning Director and with Oyubari Development Committee to discuss ski resort plan and other economic ideas. Mr. Muratsu, LENS grad and Training Director of the Hokkaido Newspaper, promises to attend August Guardians' meeting. "Week in ICA Program" begins with four sojourners. Nineteen letters written to Tokachi and Shiribeshi prefectures prepare for circuits in Weeks 7 and 8; and LENS follow-up includes the translation into English of a participant's very positive commentary on his LENS experience.

Internal: Rick Pezoldt begins new English classes, and Elaine and Carol Butcher begin leading special children's English classes immediately after arriving for one-year assignment. House receives exciting letters on Global Council from Mrs. Sato and Mr. Tonosaki.

Contradiction: Finding ways to make newly organized information (mostly in English) available to Japanese colleagues. (Wk. 5)*

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Darwin City Council requests October LENS. First order is dispatched from Murrin Bridge Industry. A colleague travels to New Zealand.

Internal: Palamer Telakau gets a job; and House takes on new look as bathroom is redecorated.

Contradiction: Lining up regional support for area council and program. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE

External: Regional team attends Lachlan Tourist meeting and exposes people to Murrin Bridge Industry. Orders being pouring in from a week of local promotion and Tom Muir writes an article on Murrin Bridge for *DAA Quarterly*. Forty hand-written invitations are sent out to Canberra Region colleagues for August event.

Internal: House spends Week II working with financial figures and participates in a wine and cheese tasting evening at Lake Cargelligo.

Contradiction: Continuing to move on all fronts while pushing adult responsibility towards community core formation. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Regional team does third in-service session for State Youth Education officers, consisting of demonstration workshop and methods explanation. Trip to rural town of Pingelly helps regional team clarify situation for Special Forum on Unemployment August 14. LENS collegium targets Perth prospects, and colleague mailing is prepared with latest Australian LENS letter. Colleagues Trevor Good and Chris Sweet, now settled in Perth, drop by to introduce themselves and catch up on news of the movement; and *Meet New People* strategy takes form as team hosts young couple, active in church, youth and community work, for tea.

Internal: Panchayat working papers on *Polity* and *Foundations* are basis for two good study sessions with colleague. Don Baker lands job with University Engineering Department working on steam engines; inkind victories range from tyres to food to tickets for *Nine to Five*; and House celebrates with carnival of games, peanut hunt and costumes.

Contradiction: Having no programmatic death ground to focus energy and waiting to risk until all contacts, courses, staff, etc. are perfect. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Regional team rejoices with receipt of 1000 copies of *Synopsis of the South Australian Conference on Human Development in the '80s*. Roundtable workshop on focus for movement and development of a phrase with same impact as *renewing the local church* is great spirit event for team.

Internal: Amanda Telford's 12th birthday is celebrated twice during the week, and House celebrates 4th of July seeing old American film, *Smokey and The Bandit* at Walford Church of England Girls Grammar School, where Mike teaches.

Contradiction: Enabling corporate quarter timeline to emerge from whole regional team to sustain missional engagement. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Working relationship with Housing Commission moves a step during visit with Estates Manager about LENS, accommodation and an urban sign. Regional team creates letter inviting colleagues to Roundtable.

Internal: House sends out Barry and Louise to Global Council. Office is transformed into a collegium room for two during month of Council.

Contradiction: Phasing Quarter I maneuvers to enable intensification of tactics during Weeks 3-5 with two in House. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Team continues calls for Field Research Practicum. *Have-A-Go* Gazette newsletter is prepared with articles typed and envelopes addressed.

Internal: Collegium on Bultmann's *Crisis of Faith* paper enhances House common memory. First pay packet from Suzanne's full-time job comes in.

Contradiction: Focusing the situation and understanding of the new strategic thrust. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: A week of drafting, visiting local representatives, typing and revisiting finally results in three development proposals in the mail to Shell, Mobil and BP as US\$200 arrives from Shell on Regional Consult request.

Internal: Receipt of long-awaited car parts means possibility of a car again. News of Global Council is well received.

Contradiction: Balancing permeation demands against missional priorities. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AGANA

External: TASC (Trans Atoll Service Corporation) opens first outer island branch in Wotje and negotiates use of former Coop warehouse and store for second branch in Ailinglaplap. Moves elicit the following response from the Chief Secretary of the Government of the Marshall Islands, "Think service, service, service, and all the rest (financing) shall be added unto you." Foreign Affairs Minister adds, "I want to invest in TASC because your personnel are imaginative (sidewalk sales are fun!), open (they can talk about their business), and clean (tidy work space and persons)."

Internal: TASC commits second floor KITCO store building for ICA office and staff residence. Aeto Lalemo family declares intent to move into House by end of September.

Contradiction: Focusing on the Region while Majuro Metro turns into a formidable suction pump of immense possibilities. (Wk. 7)*

Internal: David Beale spends weekend in House activities including the celebration, seeing *The Music Man* at the Miller Outdoor Theater.

Contradiction: Maintaining sense of direction and urgency when temperature is high and number of apparently available troops seems very low. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: The Regional Team, including two symbolic and one movemental Order, completes four Citizen Leadership Training workshops in Quitman County, Mississippi. The GOVCP team finishes year-end documentation.

Internal: House welcomes Artis Pruitt from Jackson Metro for two-day sojourn and sends out the Howards and colleague Marge Swacker to Global Council.

Contradiction: Being patient in summer press when feeling vacuum in corporate long-range brooding. (Wk. 2)

External: Susan Stevens, Jesse, Leila, John, and Sylvia participate in Global Council for New Orleans Region. Imaginal Education, Community LENS and Corporation LENS Pedagogy have profound impact.

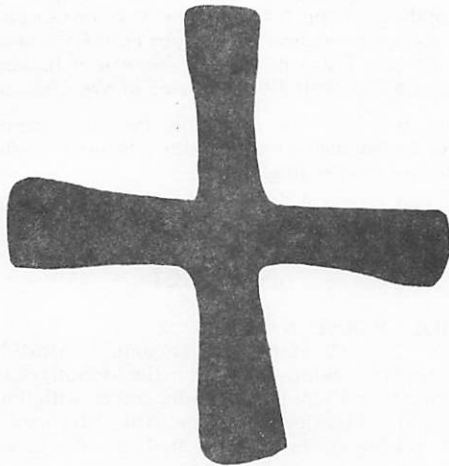

Internal: House decides to have two workdays for two hours in a week by getting up at 5:00 in the morning to music and the ringing of the bell as a signal to go to the vegetable farm and help the Economic Team in their new venture. House celebrates the birthdays of Martin and Kristianne together.

Contradiction: Working in five arenas with less expense and different tasks but maintaining group's momentum. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Gaisano sends a sewing order for 200 electric pan covers. Bagrass seedlings are distributed to Langub villagers. Magtuod General Store expands location in the center.

Internal: House receives brochure from Salani HDP and continues House Bagrass replanting.

Contradiction: Preparing for Daycare Worker Training sponsored by MSSD Week 6. (Wk. 5)*

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Development continues in Quarter I with receipt of 100,000 yen from the Conventuals Religious Order, symbolizing their strong collegueship.

Internal: The House is full again although this month has been a game of "musical rooms" with all the comings and goings, and cleaning is key.

The church also catalyzes participation of two dentists who see 25 people from three villages, pulling teeth which would have cost US\$300 in clinics.

Internal: Miss Oh Hae Sook and Mrs. Min (Kim Seong Hee) strengthen the leadership team and help bring off the miracles of the Student Encounter week in which the New Religious Mode helps everyone's journey.

Contradiction: Utilizing the many possibilities and resources which are appearing in order to prepare this cluster to care for clusters across the nation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Fifty Buddhist priests (Nichiren Sect), representing the leadership from Kyushu and Okinawa, attend exciting Town Meeting at their largest temple in Kumamoto. Two advisors, Mr. Tasai and Mr. Tsukamoto, are on leadership team with ICA staff. This meeting will catalyze other Town Meetings with local temples.

Internal: Takashi Hara (resident volunteer) gets job as administrator (interpreter) with a construction company in Tokyo and will accompany a Japanese engineer to Iraq for one year. Entire House spends weekend at Tsutate Onsen (hotspring) and peers into Mt. Aso, world's largest active volcano.

Contradiction: Making necessary preparations for new resident volunteers and staff. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Friday Night at the Institute meeting finishes a 13-week study on Third World *Development and Freedom* by Soejita Kinoko. 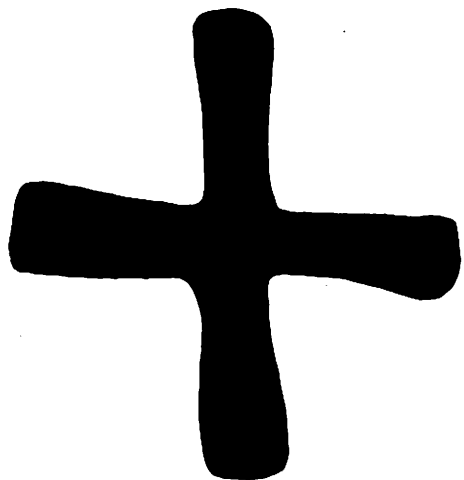

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the year's maneuvers are launched around the globe with circuits in Hong Kong and Seoul, invitations from European corporations for proposal submission, and Annual Appeal training and set up in North America. High interest in LENS is reported in North America and Hong Kong. The key contradiction lies in the arena of utilizing continental, area and regional councils to solidify consensus on bottom lines and launch development tactics with power.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the year is launched with Brussels preparing for Continental Council, Chicago gearing up for North American Area Councils and Hong Kong initiating an intensive reading project in research on China. The varied categories of research are pulled together in three thrusts: Social Innovations — including HDZ and Structural Revitalization; Intellectual Edge — including Academy and Curriculum Development; and Spirit Motivation — including Global Regional Team Formation and Support and the Research Network. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the commonality in the formation colloquys across the continents and the mechanism for discerning HDZ's in the regions.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports the cross-centrum study of Global Council mandates, priorities and memorials in preparation for the councils. Hong Kong re-rounds the operations task in relation to the HDZ. Chicago finishes first draft of Global Comprehensive Filing System in time for councils. Brussels finishes transcript of Fort-night talks in move toward clarity of the Global Formation Colloquy. The key contradiction lies in the arena of how to do training and thinking in anticipation of councils that enables rather than pre-judges the dialogue of the region.

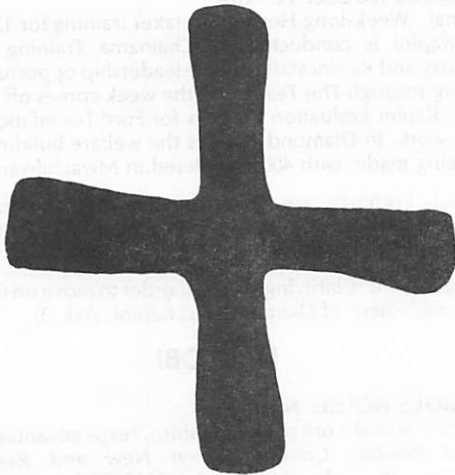
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

In the midst of laying out an 18-week timeline and four-week maneuvers during the centrum planning, Chicago prepares for area council budgeting workshops and celebrates the Health Desk transfer. The breakthrough comes in expanding managing skills that will broaden the base of those who can participate in finance, publishing and housing tasks. TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: First six Town Meetings held with Western Japan Railway Company (Nishi Tetsu) involve 150 employees. House trains and sends out eight high school students to United States for one-year home stay (host families) program.

Contradiction: Using creatively a "waiting state", due to car accident and contracts as yet unsigned regarding self-support. (Wk. 10)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that battleplans and major maneuvers launch the new year. North American Annual Appeal builds incredible momentum with 925 appointments on the calendar and 282 pledges recorded for a total of \$503,000 by end of third "official" day. Regions are capitalizing on last year's Regional Consults and other programs as the Annual Appeal focuses on the individual constituency. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining an open and innovative stance when it is time to remaneuver.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the second draft of *IMAGE #4* is underway, the Global Academy has 69 registered three weeks before opening night and moving forward, Kuala Lumpur Nexus prepares for Area Councils and a four-week plan. The Internal Life Guide goes out to Area Councils the first week of September. The key contradiction lies in the arena of settling in to new centrum configurations and timing on practical research arenas.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Kuala Lumpur prepares materials for Area Councils including workshops on LENS, Global Formation Colloquy and cluster HDZ; Tonga LENS arrangements are finalized, and the Jamaican LENS trek begins 6-week course and marketing focus. Follow-up LENS calls in SEAPAC disclose great impact even after 18 months, with the analysis done in LENS assisting Kuala Lumpur bank funding and still providing common ground for current planning. The key contradiction lies in the arena of coalescing missional thrusts into operating systems.

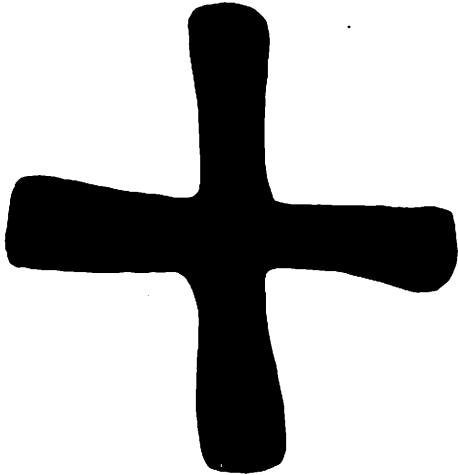
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Training your shadow while on a fast-moving train. (Wk. 11)*

External: House has great work visit with Lindsays and Brian Williams that produces 30 new names for LENS marketing. Mary Quinn arrives from India, enthusiastic and asking how we do the same thing here.

Internal: To symbolize the seriousness of House intentions relative to self-support, all House members register at local job center.

Contradiction: Getting ready for already planned programs (like Volunteers Orientation Weekend — V.O.W.) while initiating large new directions such as LENS breakthrough and Regional Team formation. (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Busy start to new year includes House planning session followed by visits to colleagues in Manchester, Ayr, Glasgow and Edinburgh. Team sends regional letter to 100 in Glasgow and Manchester Regions. Jean Taylor and John Francis attend LENS marketing context in London.

Internal: House sends out Sr. Yvonne to return to her order after spending two weeks with Paris House, and Sr. Benedict spends an evening sharing news. Angelo comes to dinner — getting ready for Global Academy, and Danny O'Neil and Beverly paint the steps.

Contradiction: Getting clear on what self-support will and won't require. (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Representatives return from Madrid and Frankfurt Area Councils. One day's calling on religious orders in Belgium produces \$1000 in hand.

Internal: Week of celebrations — birthday, send out of Sarah, and parent visits — creates lively atmosphere.

Contradiction: Getting new decor on walls to reflect new year, while already on the road in all Centurms. (Wk. 12)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Brugge-West Flanders Economic Development Council holds closing celebration for 15 Indonesian government employees and praises ICA training as key to nine-month course. Commitment is made for retreat next spring (\$1500). Two more conversations on Global Council participation raise hopes for "seriously considering".

Internal: House has truly awesome final celebration in House office with avocados, beef, champagne, Mozart, Lao-Tse and silence that radiates effulgence.

Contradiction: Regional Consult report awaits French and Flemish translations to move while the iron is hot. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Area Council produces area calendar with assignments across the area that provide opportunity for everyone to participate in Area Interchange this quarter. House sends John out for a week as Vienna House becomes geographical reality and sends Kathy Barton to London for LENS trek.

Internal: Frankfurt House, all together for first time, studies *Community* paper and puts together Area Council prep. House sends out sojourner Rainer Edelmann after month's stay and celebrates birth of new Order member, Mark Alan Williams.

Contradiction: Creating vehicle that will allow sailing over chaos of complicated schedules and unfamiliarity with the turf. (Wk. 12)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Continental Council launches House, region and area into new orbit with three metro colleagues from Amsterdam participating and one colleague deciding to move into House for volunteer training. Invitations are mailed for Regional Council and the annual Board of Directors meeting.

Internal: House announces the birth of baby Mark Alan to the Joyce and Roger Williams family on the 9th of September. The arrival of a new baby boy occasions some brooding on the new life spirit breaking loose in the House and region.

Contradiction: Integrating global, continental and regional strategies into one thrust beyond organisation of time, troops and money for immediacies. (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

Internal: Circuit to Hamberg includes key visits in four sectors and CYF with 18 youth representing four youth groups.

Internal: Big job hunt goes on with Gillette job already started and contacts made for long-range and immediate work.

Contradiction: Building inclusive quarter battleplan for House when continental and areal maneuvers emphasize only the external. (Wk. 12)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Continental and area councils provide new breadth in strategy. List of references for W.H.O. (World Health Organization) is completed; guardians approve health document and begin promotion publicity. Team sets up development appointments in Oslo where recent election radically changes government to conservative. House is represented at local school celebration.

Internal: Convergence occurs when Terry Fahrenbacher, returning House members and a new washing machine all emerge from German trains in time for first Common Meal together. While Liz works 135 straight hours in operating room on downtown bomb victims, new team works on W.H.O. consultancy ending with House celebration with wine and chips.

Contradiction: Creating winning story and ways into permeation while hoisting internal/external sails for Quarter II. (Wk. 12)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: Globally assigned Vienna House team crosses border into Austria at 1804 hours GMT, 15 September, 1981, escorted by Area Frankfurt prior. Team spends next five days calling on key colleagues, getting acquainted with Austrian frame, searching out new program possibilities, looking for temporary housing and preparing for Nexus Development trek.

Internal: Two and one half hours after entering Austria, House celebrates arrival in Vienna with a meal of Bachhendl with Wienerschnitzel and a bottle of wine at local restaurant.

Contradiction: Finding temporary facility out of which to operate while looking for the facility that will enable mission for all of Area Budapest. (Wk. 12)*

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Clean water is flowing into Sheik Ali as team completes one community tap and seals leaks in mainline and tank. Preschool moves into its new facility, making available four more rooms for ICA residence. Area Council held in new Cairo office results in regional intensification maneuvers.

Internal: Corporate work day moves ICA office in Cairo to new flat, and team celebrates work with moonlight sailboat ride on the Nile.

Contradiction: Finalizing quarter's maneuvers in midst of unclarity regarding Beni Suef authorization and completing plans for meshing program commitments with staff time (two staff have taken governorate jobs and are part-time auxiliary). (Wk. 12)*

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Area Council decides to open Accra ICA office, Brobo training center and to launch two new clusters as part of first phase of HDZ. Member of Parliament from Brobo Sous Prefecture takes Regional Team with him to visit the number two man in the Ministry of the Interior to move toward ICA recognition by the government of the Ivory Coast. The M.P. agrees to endorse ICA with a formal request to the Minister.

Internal: Nelson Ngenja arrives from Kenya in time for Area Council. Team initiates the completed Accra Region and Brobo Cluster plans for the year and quarter by sending Steve and Nelson out on the helicopter to Accra.

Contradiction: Identifying pivotal steps necessary to launch year's plans in development, LENS and language school. (Wk. 11)*

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: House picks up 40 new chairs for the Ijeda Community Centre donated by the Vono Furniture Company. Team mails 50 letters announcing date of the area council. John leaves on week-long circuit to Jos and Kano in northern Nigeria.

Internal: Returning troops from Chicago enable transformation and decorating of both Lagos and Ijede facilities, including total tribal resettlement. House celebrates Tippetts' arrival, their 22nd wedding anniversary and Mike's 44th birthday at Weekly Ritual in Ijede.

Contradiction: Getting on top of activities during summer dispersment of troops to get into position for area council by end of September. (Wk. 11)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Week-long Health Caretaker training for 12 villages and Kapini is conducted by Chainama Training Center. Auxiliary and Kapini staff provide leadership opportunity and training through *The Team*, and the week comes off as a fine event. Kapini Evaluation Officers for Ford Foundation Grant begin work. In Diamond Villages the welfare building bricks are being made, with 400 completed in Mwachilwana.

Internal: Evenings are spent on the implementaries of Quarter I maneuvers, ending with a Saturday night special bonfire and story-telling time.

Contradiction: Clarifying vision in order to move on the practical enablement of Diamond and Kapini. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Muputi Cluster's Farmer Scheme is off to flying start with 640 farmers in two-day training in six separate sub-locations with one site packing 140 farmers into one classroom — a 10-fold increase over last year's training. Mr. Lee, the People's Republic of China's UNEP Delegate, agrees to visit House and discuss China with his slides. Team symbolizes new year with two new cluster consults, Kamwala and Thange, and site selection for Kitui District. Urban trip is HDTI high point with visits to Firestone, the Snake Pit and Karen Village Technology Center. Development receives money from Pfizer and nod from Ford Foundation to draw up second phase proposal.

Internal: Experiencing wonder of spending four dinners going through Journey Exercises of the Global Council, House sends out Nelson Njenga to Abidjan. Great Roundtable centers on *Declaration* in conjunction with Hajega family leaving for Jamaica assignment with letters for Jamaica Project as House welcomes Slicker and Wiegel family.

Contradiction: Co-ordinating on-going programs to enable leap into next quarter with a bang and not confusion, and releasing engagement symbolically and practically. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: First Women's Institute is held in Maliwada for one week with 35 ICA staff women participating and every woman receives a blue sari and briefcase labeled "*Women's Institute, Maliwada, August 1981*". Parallel E.G. structures for 17 children under two years of age demonstrate possibility of intentional curriculum and care. A bank opens in the Jawale Project.

Internal: House sends out two people to Kenya with an ice cream celebration and hosts two new arrivals, Wendy and Ken.

Contradiction: Waiting for clarity on external thrust for Nexus until continental council takes place. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Village *shramdam* in Sikror builds three more brick roads; and Rs.50,000 (US\$7,000) is received from the Netherlands Embassy for further road work. Three-year documentation is completed and awaits printing. Delhi staff hosts ten Canadian Crossroads volunteers at the beginning of three-months work in India; four will work with ICA.

Internal: Pauline Prakesh and Geeta Bhojar visit Maliwada for one-week *Nava Gram Prayas* Women's Training Institute. Newly assigned staff, Mukesh and Wendy, join team.

Contradiction: Beginning first steps of new year in the midst of unclear HDZ and Sikror roles in whole area strategy. (Wk. 11)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Surprise visit by Sub-Collector brings promise of a stall at Jogipet market for Nadlapur vegetables and commerce (general store). Villagers dig 75 pits in anticipation of fruit tree and beautification planting while documentation of Circle Survey and Town Meetings is finished. Thirteen villagers meet for next step of initiating poultry farms while 11 pairs of bullocks arrive from bank loan.

Internal: Collegium, witness and hosting in morning are imaged as training dynamics; assignments by team for members doing daily enablement help create teamhood, and collegiums on decor, house equipment and utensils enable corporateness and deeper understanding of internal life dynamics.

Contradiction: Finding ways to release people's images beyond that of immediacy — busy planting season. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Frantic and fantastic week of Nexus planning and area council preparation lays out battleplan for next four weeks, forges cross-Centrum teams for area councils, and installs new TRSOO5 computer.

Internal: House welcomes weary travelers from Global Council with sparkling facility and refreshments in lounge and sends out first team of three to area councils.

Contradiction: Getting feet firmly planted in the year's task with no roof over heads as yet. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: During circuit, a new village discusses with Sungai Lui village leaders their hope for next program to implement small bamboo and rotan industry. Monique Dion visits from Canada.

Internal: Welch family goes to Port Dickson for one-week discontinuity.

Contradiction: Establishing House facility. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Closing ceremony of District Health Module commissions 91 Health Caretakers from 16 towns and initiates new structure for health care to reach all families in the district. New Preschool Teachers Association recognizes Bubun teachers as catalysis for six new village preschools, the only non-middle class preschools in the state, and plans new teamwork between city and village preschools. Week is celebrated as District Health Official leads spirit-filled meeting promising the sustenance of District Tanjung Pura as Demonstration for all to see.

Internal: Two Muslim Indonesian staff are commissioned at Area Council as interns in the Order: Ecumenical after living in the Medan House as Trainees for two years. Whole House participates in "victory before the battle" celebration of Area Council in Jakarta and welcomes Gene Hunter to the team.

Contradiction: Discerning how to respond to all the possibilities of working with those who care in the region until the form of "intensive demonstration expansion" becomes more clear (i.e. where to locate facility?). (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Team continues Regional Consult follow-up momentum with presentation to Dago Rotary in Bandung Metro. Jakarta Metro colleagues activate translators guild with two documents finished. Emphasis on area communications initiates area council preparations, and in kind push recontextualizes former supporters and renews interest in ICA programs.

Internal: Scott Leggett returns from discontinuity in Central Java and Shanklands return from Global Council, and House is global Wayside Inn as five continents are represented by individuals en route to new assignments. Rice expert explains that before the Bontoa HDP, the LPPM had never worked directly with local farmers. The farmers of last year's double rice crop demonstration are planning, inviting and recruiting for cluster-wide planning for massive double rice program in the cluster this year. They push Agriculture Department to use vision, contradiction, etc. methods, not just speeches.

Contradiction: Preparing for farmers module in the district while enabling the cluster (sub-district) to shine before Area Council. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Centurms participate in Taipei and Tokyo bi-regional meetings. Rob Duffy assists with Korea "new cluster expansion" planning. Development treks to Tokyo and Taipei. House participates in the Chinese culture by enjoying Mid-Autumn ("Moon") Festival and Cantonese lessons taught by sojourner Alan Wong.

Internal: Newness comes with announcement of a March arrival to the Elliot family, self-support bonus with "American Voice—Jim Bell" and the opening of school.

Contradiction: Designing Centrum work time in midst of emphasis on securing permeation jobs and doing regional support that will release full engagement in missional task. (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Summer Youth Program with four villages of Fang Liao Township ends with youth bicycle trip to Hai Ou as highlight of week. Team begins preparations for closing celebration and documentation. House sends out one of four six-week volunteers to return to family and college.

Internal: Taipei staff returns from 1981-82 bi-regional planning in Hai Ou and proceeds immediately to PSU on comprehensive year's strategy for Taipei.

Contradiction: Establishing momentum for victory in a year in which new, untested programs and tasks are implemented. (Wk. 12)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: First Economic Fair on the Island finishes with total participation of 300 people from all over the Island coming to Sudtonggan to witness one-day event that makes Sudtonggan people proud of what economic structure means to them. Fair features championship games of men's basketball and women's volleyball, in which clusters win most top prizes. Highlights are distribution of prizes by a guardian of Cebu in the afternoon and community social dance in the evening.

Internal: House garden is real demonstration to village as first harvest goes to demonstration kitchen. House celebrates the birth of Joannah Jayne Aguirang.

Contradiction: Looking forward on how to mobilize the next quarter. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Sixty patients attend Pre-Skin Clinic in Langub HDP conducted by Region XI Skin Clinic. Team holds village worker meeting for Cacao and Bagrass Survey. Langub holds workday for Demonstration Preschool and La-Paz beautification for coming fiesta.

Internal: Smith and Steve visit Davao House for agricultural research. House sends out Esmeraldo Pamat and Erenio Asigurado to Cebu for Philippine Council.

Contradiction: Preparing Preschool Festival. (Wk. 11)*

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Three more Town Meetings are held for Nishi Tetsu (Western Japan Railway Company) — one is recorded on video as means of selling Town Meeting to other divisions. Setagaya government ward office (home ward of Tokyo House) signs up three staff for November LENS Symposium. Warner Lambert asks for one and a half day LENS for next week with their Schick division.

Internal: Four-day Area meeting is held at House, and at the closing celebration the Pattersons are received as Fellows and the Reeses celebrate their 30th wedding anniversary. Mr. Deguchi, House sojourner, returns after three weeks in Sutonggan and Manila. Management trek to House insures financial victory this year.

Contradiction: Having adequate corporate time to plan missional task while being pulled ahead by the mission. (Wk. 12)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The first in-House LENS in Korea is in the making — SAEHAN Motors (General Motors) wants a LENS proposal. This experiment may lead to further use of LENS in company.

Internal: Shifting gears into new year is symbolized by return of Hockleys, send out of Lee Kang Jin family to Houston, and decor workday.

Contradiction: Launching development week, House transformation and regional council all with brilliance without losing something in the launching of the year. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: Ho Jeong 1 Ri's village hall is filled for viewing of slides by Dr. Himo Kim, initiator and founder of nearly 100 "Sidewalk" preschools in Korean cities, who stresses importance and possibilities of early education. After one month with village preschool, enthusiastic villagers are proud of the change in their children and are encouraging other cluster villages to get preschools started. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Regional team hosts 96 at New York Area Council held at scenic Fernbrook Center. With less than 24-hours notice, regional team attends Annual Appeal Coordinators' meeting, resulting in enthusiastic Annual Appeal team equipped to make appointments and do visits in several metros. Team confirms site for Area Guardian Meeting scheduled for Quarter II Week 4 in Philadelphia.

Internal: Representative of ecumenical community of Taizé joins Roundtable and gives inspiring side presentation about history and work of Taizé community plus overview of *The Pilgrimage of Hope 1981* to be held in Philadelphia on October 17.

Contradiction: Keeping imaginal focus on Annual Appeal for next two weeks. (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Annual Appeal thermometer passes two-thirds mark at \$20,000 with real accomplishment being encounters with old and new colleagues — invariably spirit-filled. Regional council preparation includes Permeation PSU involving three non-resident members of regional team. Researcher from Stanford Research visits.

Internal: House experiences perpetual movement as Flozelle Foy and Andrew Knusen stop by, Sally Fenton and her mother, Cordie Smith, arrive with TV game. So none would be denied, the entire House resettles.

Contradiction: Orchestrating Annual Appeal follow through while launching program and self-support maneuvers for Quarter II. (Wk. 13)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Colleagues from five metros, representing 241 years of movement experience, gather for Regional Council sharing reports and kicking off Annual Appeal with every family pledging. Annual Appeal dinners at House provide opportunity to update colleagues and renew pledges; four metros bring in two-thirds of bottom line in first week. Boston College calls to ask ICA to help set up international work program, and Dartmouth student initiates plan to volunteer with ICA in Egypt in March 1982. Edie Ward, Quarter IV RS-1 grad, is fifth person to register for Global Academy.

Internal: House enables Charge Conference at Fishel's church, sends out Meredith Sibley, recent Academy grad, to San Francisco House and University of California at Berkeley during House Church, and hosts surprise candlelight dinner to celebrate Bengel's anniversary. Youth Cluster makes great decor for Regional Council and Debbie Griffin lands a job.

Contradiction: Creating time design that honors both immediate missional demands and futuric model building.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: House enables Sassatras Store to complete financial statements and projections to clarify way to victory. Representative from Department of Agriculture sets up RVI planning session at House for next eight-months activity in Maine. Irene Frederick of Starks and Louise Charrette of Guild join House in 14-hour drive to Area Council near Philadelphia and experience "down to earth eye-opener".

Internal: House hosts Bob Fishel family returning from vacation in Canada. Garden produces vegetables for both Council and winter freezing.

Contradiction: Picking up pieces of the year and moving ahead. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: Team experiences deep struggle with issues of responsible leadership and official commitment to designated roles as village holds assembly, followed by various meetings with lively discussions on needs and roles. Development brings in wood for church construction and promise of \$470 in total from two companies.

Internal: House sends out long-time sojourner-student Alison Hart to USA for vacation and completion of university requirements, reducing auxiliary to threesome, encouragingly supported by village leadership core.

Contradiction: Redirecting interest-group orientation and emphasis on polarization of residents into corporate vision of one community in a common task. (Wk. 6)*

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Two LENS courses — one with the Anglican Church and one with Basic Services — and CYF point to networks with which regional team will be working during coming year.

Internal: House welcomes Rosses and anticipates arrival of Hajegas. House resettlement includes bed build-ing and moving into new rooms in a second facility.

Contradiction: Getting new staff oriented in the midst of on-going program is like jumping on a train going 40 m.p.h. (Wk. 11)*

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Casava sweet industry team in Azpitia meets to deliberate over the crisis of having their week's earnings stolen; event provides opportunity to realize that they are in charge and then they double their production. Farmers team meets for "mini" agricultural forum and decides to meet weekly; they meet with Frank Capak, engineer working with DePauw University work camp group, to anticipate January work. Team makes funding and authorization calls for Training School projected for November.

Internal: House and community bids farewell to Paul Zolinski, Alejandro Moreno (to Caracas), Eliseo and Geronima Rivas (to Guatemala) in spirit-filled farewell party. House and community enjoy whirlwind visits of Raphael Davila and Tony and Ellery Elizondo, and receives Beth Hamje and Nina Crow.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in the midst of shifting auxiliary team and "first of the year" ambiguity. (Wk. 11)*

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: New forces arrive in time to join final stages in creating a Demonstration Training Center in Cano Negro. New directors visit all ten cluster villages. The Barlovento Human Development Team meets with Caracas House and produces a practical vision for the year and a list of "creative conundrums".

Internal: House celebrates first full week of expenditure with trip to beach. Hur Myung Hee is sent out to new assignment in Toronto with a *despedida* in her honor in Cano Negro. Alejandro Morreno arrives for new assignment from Peru and Paul Zolinski arrives to add continental creativity and zest to House life.

Contradiction: Maintaining an orchestrated balance between planning and action, preparation and positioning. (Wk. 11)*

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Team receives donation of light bulbs and florescent tubes from Electromat (subsidiary of General Electric). Commission in Sol de Septiembre moves toward completing preparations for big three-day celebration of Independence Day — including crowning of a queen (a first). Team completes preparation for semi-annual report to Ministry of Justice.

Internal: First step for securing temporary one-year residence visas for House team is completed in record time. House begins search for sleeping site so that self-support maneuver can be actualized.

Contradiction: Swimming not stopping in midst of ocean of ambiguities. (Wk. 12)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Training for health careworkers and regular meetings in the three Rio Bonito extension villages happens with the new regional team taking on major responsibilities. Coca-Cola continues their yearly financial support three months ahead of time.

Internal: Alberto Rosario holds down the fort during Global Council and gives inspiration to the regional team. Hosting of House guests continues as work intensifies in the region.

Contradiction: Expanding on numerous program advantages with reduced troop strength. (Wk. 3)

QUARTER I WEEKS TWELVE & THIRTEEN

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports treks to Tokyo and Taipei, US\$1000 in hand in one day from Belgian religious orders, Denmark's largest cooperative commits US\$5000, and 1216 Annual Appeal commitments total \$1,018,469 after two intensive weeks on the road in North America. The regional teams complete part one of Annual Appeal with a variety of regional celebrations and a Chicago Nexus champagne breakfast. North American Annual Appeal is running well ahead of last year at this time. There are many new pledgers and brand new donors, and numerous appointments set for Weeks 1 and 2. Regional colleagues commit themselves to Development task and one becomes President of ICA Board in Netherlands. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pegging down remaining \$200,000 of 1.2 Annual Appeal in next two weeks while shifting focus to comprehensive constituency coverage around the band.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports the University Guild meets for first time at Chicago Nexus and creates a picture of the year and Quarter II, *IMAGE #4* goes into final draft, the Global Academy inkinds one fourth of its budget with one week until opening night, Research Centrum in Hong Kong welcomes Wong Chi Wah (Alan) as an intern following a year as a sojourner. The Hong Kong Nexus House devotes six collegiums to the Five Great Talks. The key contradiction lies in the arena of a breakloose in training — Academy with 100, Human Development and Profound Motivity courses — which is running ahead of tactical plans and back-up systems, making it difficult to keep the momentum going.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports creative revision of Imaginal Education course for broader use as a regional training tool and Imaginal Education Pedagogy with 20 participants, all phases, initiates year of regular Week II pedagogy in Chicago. The Student House forms stakes and guilds as it implements the cycle theme "Building Our Commuminty" while participating daily in assisting global interchange through Operations Centrum. Massey-Ferguson LENS is held this week out of Chicago, and London hosts LENS marketing maneuver. Hong Kong participates in Area Tokyo planning meetings and Seoul cluster implementation. First Guardians Meeting in Cheong Ju City indicates readiness for practical engagement in cluster villages. Phase I moves towards greater involvement with other phases in missional relationships. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating the consensus which defines Operations' role in developing and testing the Formation Colloquy and program acceleration strategies in order to release functional instruments in the regions.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Executive committee of the USA Board meets and hears the financial reports on the Institute. ICA A.B. Dick press proves its capabilities by printing Munising ad flyer in three colors. Hong Kong Management trek to all Houses in Japan proves to be key in establishing financial victory for year. Institute Finance in Chicago welcomes surprise \$12,000 Standard Oil dividend, deals with Global Council's travel desk nitty gritty, and pays August Institute salaries. Brussels does workshop of Nexus self-support which sparks thinking relative to practical interchange of self-support breakthroughs among the Houses. In Chicago the key breakthrough is gaining clarity on cash flow situation, enabling the distribution of education fund checks to university students. The key contradiction lies in the arena of final positioning of assignments and clarifying of timeline so that quarter starts on firm footing.
