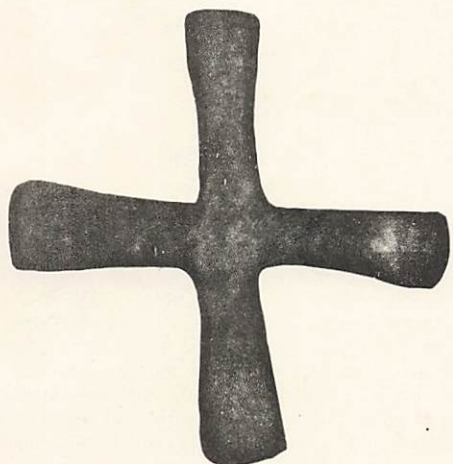

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Community Forums 12 and 13 are done this week. Both are "firsts". Marey-Gomean in Galicia Region done finally after a one-year-setup in Spain's most defeated area. Alalpardo is the first in Madrid Metro with eager community and mayor — CARITAS: Madrid is responsible for splendid setup.

Internal: Quarter II area newsletter and Spanish version of Niebhur poem (printed decor card) are mailed to 250. Break-open in Quarter III planning is broader context of circuits to include not just programs, but both framing and development as integral parts.

Contradiction: Learning how to read Quarter III map to discern difference between major highways and secondary roads. (Wk. 12)

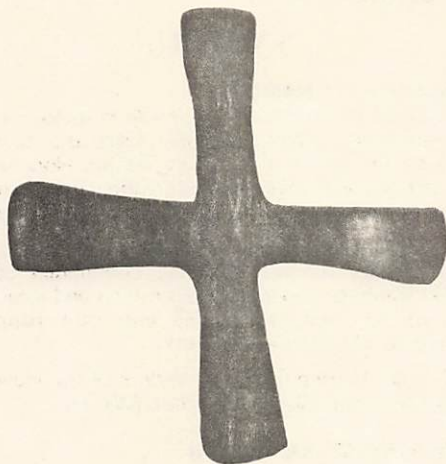

The key contradiction lies in the arena of designing work in a way that makes best use of the Regional Consult to serve comprehensively all the regions and houses during the whole quarter.

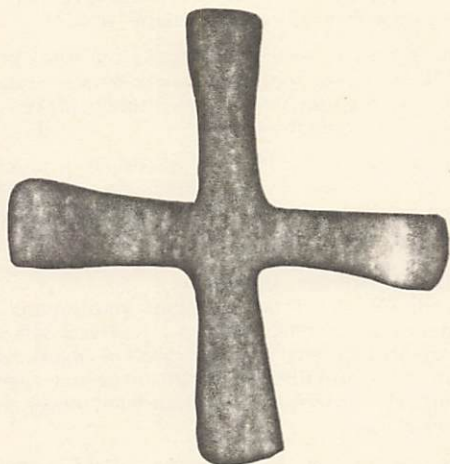
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Indication that frame is working comes through positive feedback from governors' offices in three states in one week.

Internal: The influx of three sojourners, Yoko Sugimura from Japan for ten days, David Beal from Arkansas for two months and Leanne Tigert from Nashville for a weekend, catalyzes fantastic Japanese celebration and transformation of "Command Center" into a Japanese restaurant and back — never to lose its new flavor.

Contradiction: Securing facility, date and sponsors for Regional Consult. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Critical contacts for Consult initiated Week I and three-month journey to Regional Consult is mapped out Week II.

Internal: Robert McKay's weeklong "Rite of Passage" — gifts, song and scripture, Daily Office witness, *Ronin* readings and youth celebration — culminates in participation as a youth in House quarter planning retreat at Caritas, Abita Springs.

Contradiction: Setting up command post and transiting to new roles, while maintaining ongoing operation at full speed. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First week of Senior Citizens Town Meetings, funded and assisted by Atlanta Regional Commission, brings high favor from agency people and excitement from Seniors. Week is climaxed as regional colleagues gather to lay groundwork for Regional Consult, make corporate decisions and plans (far beyond expectations) for the quarter.

Internal: Events of the week, including the new roundtable construct which provides depth spirit for new and old colleagues, bring over twenty people into house as new space lends itself to good planning and guest accommodation.

Contradiction: Continuing to lay the tracks faster than the train is coming. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The announcement of the new date for Regional Consult is mailed. Colleague, Jean Petrick, calls to give the dates when she is available for circuiting.

Internal: New Year begins with a flurry — House planning; youth and finance meetings; guests — Rick Walters and Elaine Butcher and friends; school activities, with all three youth contributing either muscle or mouth to the school rowing crews.

Contradiction: Operating out of unclear picture of what it will take to get to winner's circle. (Wk. 2)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: House participates in Global Operations and Global Research Band Meetings through collegiums and informal exchange. Phase I staff and students trek to St. Louis, Kansas City, Denver and Philadelphia youth clusters, preparing for the Youth Presidium in February.

Internal: A week of band activities is topped off by the celebration of five men's birthdays at House Church.

Contradiction: Facilitating access to specific knowledge of the regions across the globe so that the global movement can respond to the real trends. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: The regional team's six-month planning, held during the New Year holidays, is led by Jennie Pierce using the LENS format. "Best planning ever" is the statement of the day.

Internal: Four metros are represented at New Year's celebration: western saloon with a barn dance, casino and a show, "Song, Symbol and Drama of 1980".

Contradiction: Creating the compelling story for programming in an all self-support staff. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: Team sets up two days of LENS marketing, completes six-month regional planning with complete LENS format and establishes new filing system in the office. Cedar Rapids Metro circuit is planned.

Internal: Suspense is over — it's a boy, Mathew Prem Krauss, weighing 6 pounds 11 ounces and 18 inches long, born in the very last day of 1980 at 5:24 p.m. House celebrates Barbara Prather's birthday.

Contradiction: Establishing new internal and external rhythm. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Staff does presentation for the faculty of three community colleges — global film and discussion raising question of student options, forming one planning committee, and interesting one professor in sabbatical with a Human Development Project. More presentations are scheduled. Visiting pilot youth trek forges model for visits to all North American youth clusters for Presidium preparation.

Internal: Self-support launch includes in-home secretarial service marketing, focused brooding on longrange business enterprise and an "all-nighter" on a Kroger Store floor.

Contradiction: Laying track fast enough to stay ahead of the train. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: RS-I with 20 around the table strengthens and expands two regional cadres and sets the stage for global film showings, Roundtables and a March RS-I.

Internal: Thirteen regional team members pitch in with transportation, hosting, inkinding, enablement and shopping to bring off RS-I.

Contradiction: Balancing the tension between doing and planning in order to operate out of strategic models. (Wk. 2)

External: New Year's Eve party at House brings together over 50 old and new colleagues in a fine celebration. Creation of corporate "Walls of Wonder" (WOWs) for 1980 and 1981 enable appropriation of the past year as well as help to articulate the hope for the new year.

Internal: Week II regional house collegium in Indianapolis builds models for key upcoming regional council and for common house operation.

Contradiction: Creating marching orders that release metro team operations at the local level. (Wk. 1)

Contradiction: Securing involvement in all facets of newly built quarter plan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN

External: Development team of three, two from Chicago and one from the regional team, identifies new colleagues with India story and nets over \$25,000 in committed monies. Team now has 150% of Annual Appeal goal.

Internal: Entire regional team attends continental council and three stay over for Women's Revolution PSU. Carl Stock is welcomed to region in new relationship as local church pastor.

Contradiction: Enabling the community to get through the rush of Christmas activities with a clear vision of what is needed for the new year. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: New Year's celebration and four-day regional council/regional team meeting/religious house meeting results in decision for 44-hour Regional Consult PSU to work on 37 arenas of concern relative to the Regional Consult.

Internal: Bob Booher spins on Indonesia and India and the House begins to see clues to what it means to care for the pluriform order.

Contradiction: Transforming old modes of metro participation into new modes of operating as a regional team. (Wk. 1)

After reports of program edges around the globe, representatives work with principles of strategy in general, the three master strategies in particular, and the dynamics and needed forms of interchange. The global calendar for Quarters III and IV, with backup sheets of actual projected program assignments for each event, is drawn up. Particular concern for assignment rationales continues to be expanding faculty skills and enabling quality events. The key contradiction lies in the arena of adequate interchange and documentation from week to week so that all regions sense themselves as part of the edge.

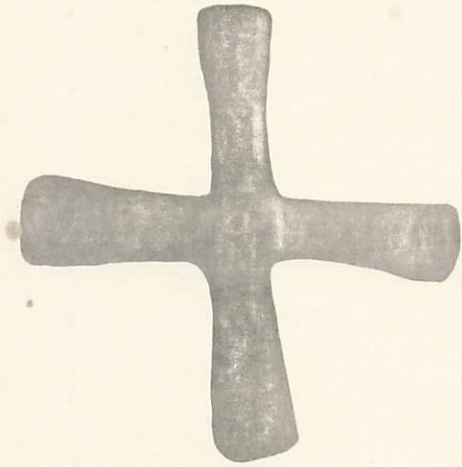
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Putting territory and structures in brackets in order to see what is possible with new eyes. (Wk. 2)

Internal: House filled with guests for two-event guest night including birthday party for Martin Luther King and Felicia Norton and teachers guest night. Job hunting spots opening for two development officers in Newport.

Contradiction: Structuring staff to support shift from a delimited project focus to a regional focus. (Wk. 3)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House secures Global Symposium facility in Versailles. Guardian dinner nights provide a bridge to deepen their involvement.

Internal: New time design releases House to say yes to the French time design and still hold tension of Day I and Day II.

Contradiction: Facilitating shift in structure of House and movemental role toward the Regional Consult. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Reports and data on India and Africa are received as Brian Robins, Diedre Dowsett and Rebecca Nichols pass through on way to and from Band Meetings.

Internal: Wednesday night EG curriculum workshop creates constructs for the quarter.

Contradiction: Creating a tactical system for Fortnight implementation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: This is a week of creating 26-week tactical overview chart, transforming the office to reflect the new year and serve the mission and having a film show with Trappist monastery.

Internal: Two quarters of study of secular and religious poetry are launched with "The First Mansion" of St. Theresa's *Interior Castle*.

Contradiction: Establishing the rhythm which allows moving on all internal, external and area business every week. (Wk. 3)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week of circuiting in home territory shows promise as authorization/framing goes well and two Dutch friends go on calls with House to see network contacts in the Netherlands Council of Churches, American Women's Club and local government. House takes time to rationalize house files for development push Weeks 4 and 5 and mails another newsletter.

Internal: Bonhoeffer paper, "Thy Kingdom Come", pushes our reflection at collegium while a decor Week II enables creation of an Earthrise banner for the regional consults in the area.

Contradiction: Trusting too few guides while charting a cultural forest. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: The Regional Consult occasions significant visits in public, private, voluntary and local sectors and reveals numerous opportunities for new style of programming.

Internal: The House visits the Berlin Museum to broaden context and deepen understanding of city.

Contradiction: Discerning the learnings from the past five years' work to release the development of the movemental order core. (Wk. 3)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME****STOCKHOLM****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Red Cross leader provides introduction to political family network at dinner in his home. A new base is established in the northwest part of Copenhagen Region. A Danish car rental network opens the possibility of covering the turf without having to buy a car (with 200% sales tax).

Internal: First roundtable grounds the reflective dimension very appropriately and first PSU is completed for structural permeation with DANIDA.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time of preparation for Consult. (Wk. 2)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA**

External: Seven hundred meters of plastic pipe is delivered to El Alema for completing the water system.

Internal: House welcomes two new staff — Saad Faiz and Fardos Yusef.

Contradiction: Clarifying status of regional authorization. (Wk. 3)

ABIDJAN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN****LAGOS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS****KINSHASA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

External: Walls going up quickly on the first HDTS building, printing brochure and beginning work on curriculum intensify the feeling that January 11 is very near. Team returns from trek to Gaborone, Botswana to report that Area Johannesburg has been *programmatically opened* with a PLC. Colleagues there want an ITI in May.

Internal: Approximately 27 tons of sand are shoveled from a nearby river bottom up onto the Kapini truck and 27 tons of sand are shoveled off at the HDTS site, by the auxiliary, in nine moonlight runs spread over five days.

Contradiction: Prioritizing keystones in relation to HDTS and continental council in Nairobi. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

External: Nairobi House hosts continental council with four areas, three nexus and two Panchayat members present, which produces a 26-week continental interchange system in the arenas of HDTI, LENS and Regional Consults. One of the highlights is the sharing of the edge work of the areas in cluster formation, longrange planning, training and the coalition cadre dynamics as well as edge thinking on the next four years of Africa. The preceding Nairobi Area Council of 150 created a new training component, a "Village Leaders Institute", and graduated 39 from the HDTI, commissioned 22 projects (6 new ones) and sent out a cluster team.

Contradiction: Developing momentum to move into Quarter III after the miraculous month of December. (Wk. 1)

Internal: Professor Sill and friends stay three days in Sikror as area priorship attends Bombay Continental Council. House celebrates Christmas with feast and film.

Contradiction: Creating corporate spirit to accomplish tasks for open day. (Wk. 13)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Four days of shramdans (workdays) in housing colony does the initial polishing for the upcoming inauguration. Three Gram Sabhas (Community Forums) are held with over 800 present.

Internal: Christmas feast at Samson's house caps two days of Christmas discontinuity. Bombay Council report given in the courtyard over supper begins a new evening style and rhythm.

Contradiction: Initiating forms of investment that catalyze corporate action by the village rather than just family or individual enterprise. (Wk. 13)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First Imaginal Education Course with teachers this year initiates tactic of permeating the education structures. Completion of set-up for visit of Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay discloses unique position of advantage for framing and funding.

Internal: Completion of quarter planning is symbolized by the creation of a detailed 15-week countdown calendar to the Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Creating images of the mission that allow staff to focus the whole and the particular. (Wk. 2)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Nexus plans Quarter III with maneuvers, timelines and input for continental council and band meetings.

Internal: An unique Christmas celebration includes out-door barbeque of ribs, chicken and hot dogs; Santa Claus; a pinata the children are afraid of; and corporate reading of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*.

Contradiction: Finding ways of integrating centrum thrusts while nexus is dispersed the next two months. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Audience with the Minister of Agriculture is debriefed with Dr. Nor Ghani, who reveals that the concept of a Community Development Division to the Prime Minister's Department and a national "cluster consult" campaign has been wholeheartedly approved. Development brings in \$13,000 the last week of the quarter — making a grand total of \$14,000 for December. Ronnie Ngantung, reporter from Ujung Pandang and recipient of an Asian journalism award for his articles on Bontoa, visits Sungai Lui and greets Abu Hassan as an old colleague from the mutually attended Bontoa Consult.

Internal: Arlene returns from SEAPAC Council and Devanesan joins House for celebrative meal.

Contradiction: Broadening image of the team that transforms squad of five into an army. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: The Camat (District Officer) instructs Kecamatan (local district) headmen to "not pressure ICA, but do your own projects". Bubun Cluster opens bank account and provincial money is released through approved budget. Loan teams complete major loan repayments after guardian holds credit meeting in Bubun.

Internal: Beginning with prior's check report on Kecamatan Experiment, House makes Quarter III plan, joined by PTPVI Permeation Probe, Richard and Gail West.

Contradiction: Releasing maneuvers and assignments to move into Quarter III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: End of quarter area priors' check produces a four-year strategy document for continental council in Manila to which House sends five representatives. National sponsor agrees to process staff visa extensions. Conversations with Islamic village clarify staff relocation timeline for end of January, 1981.

Internal: Russell White and Brian Townley arrive during discontinuity as House dispersion for discontinuity includes Jakarta, Bali, Medan, Yogyakarta, Bandung and Manila.

Contradiction: Using the residue of planning/brooding to begin the quarter with strength now rather than waiting for clarity on complex issues. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Fifteen car loads of government officials and rice research experts visit cluster rice demonstration plots with very favorable impression and plans are begun to extend Bontoa Cluster farmers' work to other districts. Six and one half million rupiah (\$10,000) is received (in cash!) for Bontoa and cluster work.

Internal: Wa'u passes through on way to SEAPAC Council. Celebrative happenings permeate the House as the New Year's Eve dynamic continues with three birthday parties. A collegium on order dynamics highlights visit from Justin Morrill.

Contradiction: Holding up the responsibilities of each centrum while designing cross-centrum assignments. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Development circuit produces HK\$10,000 in hand with commitments for more and initial yeses from major companies for sponsorship and participation in February Regional Consult. Quarter planning begins with focus on using Regional Consult to release transition image.

Internal: Weekly Roundtable becomes a birthday party for Nam Wai young man and woman who join the House for cake and conversation.

Contradiction: Moving on the consuming missional thrust while dealing with ambiguity of self-support. (Wk. 2)

External: Individual pledge cards prepared in English and Chinese are part of materials needed to launch a grassroots development campaign to raise NT\$1,000,000 (US\$28,000) from individuals during 1981 in Taiwan. Chinese proposal letters are sent to eight new companies in Kaohsiung after a week of development by multinational team composed of Chinese, British and Indian ICA staff. Appointment is set up with Mattel, Ltd. (Taiwan) to visit subcontracting factories and to explore possibilities for cottage industries in the expansion projects.

Internal: Ticketing and travel permit documents are obtained for staff to attend SEAPAC meeting at Sudtonggan HDP in the Philippines. House celebrates Christmas with European style feast at Euro-Haus Restaurant in Taipei and with a reunion of House sojourners from three years ago.

Contradiction: Deciding the balance of forces required for Quarter III that will intensify the program thrust while maintaining the foundational support functions of development and management. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Largest development month in Manila House history begins with slide show of Philippines replication, created in response to a special mid-grant request by USAID.

Internal: House members return from SEAPAC Council and proceed to guardian's mountain retreat for New Year planning and celebration.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of having made our 1980-81 development budget six months ahead of schedule. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Creating symbols to hold the pluriform responses while sustaining a corporate thrust. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Doing thorough follow-up by continuing to research program opportunity. (Wk. 3)

External: House does in-service training for Blue Hills Housing training supervisors of Title I remedial reading program, teaching them to use indicative battleplanning to create curriculum and build teams. House basically finishes

quarterly newsletter and teaches a Sunday School class on Latin America to enable a colleague to attend area development meeting.

Internal: Carpet square sewing party on Saturday night makes for colorful living space as well as promoting collegial atmosphere.

Contradiction: Ensuring that quarterly plan begins to take on practical forms. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Albany Metro meeting on Regional Consult PSU in Rochester generates great excitement, both in colleagues present and those called. Binghamton Metro sends out great introductory letter for Regional Consult and PSU. Rochester House hosts the Youth Trek, experiencing an exciting glimpse of an emerging new style for Order youth.

Christmas tree at the crossroads of the village highlights multitude of celebrational activities.

Contradiction: Anticipating happenings and occasions that enable people to experience the profound in the midst of their daily doing. (Wk. 13)

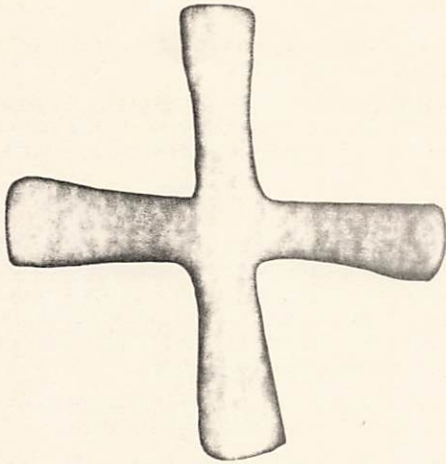
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Roundtable with Roger and Mary Ross from Saskatoon is especially rewarding through the study of paper on current trends.

Contradiction: Creating symbols to hold the pluriform responses while sustaining a corporate thrust. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: With regional plan made with colleagues, all hands engage in the particular — redoing the mailing list and card files, LENS recruitment at APU, initiating development blitz and Charles Benson's deepening commitment with Fairview Council — topped off with a regional council celebration of charades and New Year's toasts that highlight Alaska history.

Internal: House experiences major victories in sale of blue van, brand new diet, brand new skates with lessons to go with them and new roundtable construct to start the quarter.

Contradiction: Creating new maneuvers while experiencing ambiguity. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Regional colleagues lead tactical session of quarter planning. Vision and proposal charts are professionally created to add to decor. Roy and Anthony attend Edmonton PSU on development.

Internal: Four children and two adults hold a swimming celebration.

Contradiction: Forging consensus in deciding and committing ourselves to the one thing that will make a difference in the region. (Wk. 4)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: New emphasis on constituencies results in 50 foundations targeted for \$405,000 (including education, Regional Consult, Kenya, Women's Advancement, GRA, India, Academy). LENS pedagogy weekend results in 12 'new faculty' from Dallas and Houston ready to try their wings. Systems are getting in place for Regional Consult and interviews, sponsorship, etc. are started. Region is deeply grateful for reports from other regions.

Internal: Youth Trek catalyzes interest and anticipation of Presidium. In volleyball game between Phase I and the "Old Fogeys", the Old Fogeys win 2 out of 3.

Contradiction: Getting all the new systems and bright ideas for 15 missional fronts coordinated under one banner — "The Regional Consult". (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ASHERTON

External: City gets new fire engine for Christmas. Lydia's Restaurant is taken under new management of Manuel Hernandez Family — the third new business start in three months. Regional council launches Regional Consult strategy and probes into Mexican American movement and culture through conversation, holds interview with San Antonio's Citizens Organized for Public Service, and celebrates with food and dancing at the Latin Corner.

Internal: Discontinuity ends in regional team meeting highlighted by creation of a regional six-month scenario, volleyball and New Year's Eve at the Eagle Casino (an in-house den of strategy).

Contradiction: Sorting through the many options, bits of clarity and areas of ambiguity to discern the necessary strategy to release the region. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIAHOMA

External: Dallas regional team meeting is held with 16 colleagues attending in Paul's Valley, Oklahoma, with consensus made to hold a Regional Consult ("DIALOGUE '81") May 1—10, 1981, with Symposium in Dallas and Assembly in Oklahoma City. The City of Indianhoma submits a proposal on Community Extension to the Association of South Central Oklahoma Governments to put an Indianhoma slide show and mini-Town Meeting on the road. Indianhoma's Mayor, Barbara Bailey, has been nominated for the Winthrop Rockefeller Distinguished Rural Service Award for 1980.

Internal: House holds special breakfast after holidays to send the emerging generation back to school.

Contradiction: Enabling inter-metro communication and exchange in order to strengthen the solidarity of the regional team of 25 families across the region. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Metro recruitment for Regional Consult takes strides as three metros and eight polises are visited; colleagues in two metros offer office and telephone use. Facility search breaks new ground with interest of two sources in potential sponsorship. Little Rock "core" emerges as five people attend breakfast meeting and ask for assignments.

Internal: Linda Zahrt obtains fulltime position as a traveling nursing home consultant and Mary Z. Longstreth lands part-time job as secretary. Staff initiates collegium on sojourner and volunteer recruitment as Day I troops dwindle.

Contradiction: Articulating the profundity and uniqueness of the Regional Consult and securing the resources that lend authenticity to the event. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Critical contacts for Consult initiated Week I and three-month journey to Regional Consult is mapped out Week II.

Internal: Robert McKay's week long "Rite of Passage" — gifts, song and scripture, Daily Office witness, *Ronin* readings and youth celebration — culminates in participation as a youth in House quarter planning retreat at Caritas, Abita Springs.

Contradiction: Setting up command post and transiting to new roles, while maintaining ongoing operation at full speed. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First week of Senior Citizens Town Meetings, funded and assisted by Atlanta Regional Commission, brings high favor from agency people and excitement from Seniors. Week is climaxed as regional colleagues gather to lay groundwork for Regional Consult, make corporate decisions and plans (far beyond expectations) for the quarter.

Internal: Events of the week, including the new roundtable construct which provides depth spirit for new and old colleagues, bring over 20 people into house as new space lends itself to good planning and guest accommodation.

Contradiction: Continuing to lay the tracks faster than the train is coming. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Representative is sent to area development PSU in New Orleans where plans are made to begin serious cultivation of major corporations in region. Planning Convocation, held in local church with 55 people, claims the promise of a year of growth and service.

Internal: The week is highlighted with a visit from the Cramers; a picnic Saturday afternoon celebrates the rare occasion of everyone being home at the same time on a Week II.

Contradiction: Creating a strong corporate vision that unites individual priorities and maintains a creative tension with individual time schedules. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: The first IMAGE journal since 1972 — *Corporate Research Methods* - is ready for distribution. Budget recreation takes the nexus on a great journey in which the budget is seen as a releasing consciousness-raising tool in enabling the continual re-declaration of mission.

Internal: House anticipates the study of Bell's *The Cultural Contradictions of Capitalism* through a collegium discussion of the Introduction. House celebrates the style of Jaya Dethe as he is sent out to Kuala Lumpur, India and Manila. The furnace is converted from oil to gas, reducing heating costs by 1/3.

Contradiction: Taking into consideration the comprehensive picture of our cash flow to avoid the interruption of vital missional functions such as the flow of materials and publications to the movement. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: The Chicago Region breaks the back of the Chicago Regional Consult with: the completion of 209 interviews by 22 people in 6 days, by printing 12,500 brochures, preparing a mass mailing of 6,400 in seven hours and hosting 40 of the frame at the 4th graduation of 5th City Business Careers.

Internal: The 9:30 debriefings each night illuminate the hows and whys of doing interviews and increase momentum for Symposium recruitment.

Contradiction: Targeting the next visits for Symposium recruitment. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: The regional team's six-month planning, held during the New Year holidays, is led by Jennie Pierce using the LENS format. "Best planning ever" is the statement of the day.

Internal: Four metros are represented at New Year's celebration: western saloon with a barn dance, casino and a show, "Song, Symbol and Drama of 1980".

Contradiction: Creating the compelling story for programming in an all self-support staff. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: LENS marketing calls result in three requests for proposals. Jan Sanders chairs first meeting of Community Development Society of Iowa.

Internal: Rev. Kathy McDougal and Marilyn Stafford, both of Lorimor, come to roundtable.

Contradiction: Doing thorough follow-up by continuing to research program opportunity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: House does in-service training for Blue Hills Housing training supervisors of Title I remedial reading program, teaching them to use indicative battleplanning to create curriculum and build teams. House basically finishes quarterly newsletter and teaches a Sunday School class on Latin America to enable a colleague to attend area development meeting.

Internal: Powerful new collegium rationale takes House from "Radical Monotheism" to spirit analysis of East St. Louis. Term papers and final exams are completed. Basement masonry and attic insulation materials are procured. Self-support cranks along with first week's income from temporary jobs.

Contradiction: Moving ahead on the quarter's missional maneuvers without losing ground on established contacts and leads. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Lee Early and Bill Westre come in with an exciting report from Munising and join the regional team in a Saturday of hard-nosed planning for the Regional Consult. Planning ends with everybody taking task force assignments and getting a clearer picture of what the Regional Consult is and how the region can pull it off.

Internal: An invitation to watch the Superbowl at the Karguses' gives staff a chance to see its computer, housed in the Kargus bedroom where Walt can look after its care and feeding.

Contradiction: Integrating new consult objectives into the overall quarter timeline to maximize full colleague participation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: House reports results of Regional Council to metros, and they begin work on their own plans as metro councils are held and Consult documents are mailed.

Internal: A focused corporate painting of renters' space is followed by a celebration including a regional montage creation.

Contradiction: Getting beyond the great idea of formation to practical implementing models. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Metro Council, with 24 adults and 10 Emerging Generation participating, results in six maneuvers to implement regional priorities discerned during the Regional Consult.

Internal: Youth Cluster is invited out to high school teacher's home for dinner in appreciation for cluster's contribution to classroom community.

Contradiction: Keeping our working and symbolic decor up to date and life giving. (Wk. 3)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Hard-won decisions are re-made on the location of

the New York Regional Consult (Clinton Inn, Tenafly, New Jersey), the dates (March 20-29) and the fees (\$120 per person for 2 weekends and the practicum week).

Internal: A discontinuous lunch at Moon Palace Restaurant evokes a profound conversation on the why of Regional Consult as it relates to our past story and our operating vision of the future.

Contradiction: Pulling the profound why through our own lives and corporate journey so that we may effectively tell the story of the Regional Consult. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Hostage return impacts roundtable at Armours'. Alan Crain spreads his enthusiasm for Maliwada and shares the impact of the Maliwada House prior on his life with the circuit team. Inked victories of offset plates for CEM document and Gestafax stencils for Regional Consult are received. Annual Appeal report and thank-yous are sent to regional donors.

Internal: House appreciates helpful images provided by Training Post Collegium I on formation.

Contradiction: Ensecuring maximum regional team participation in Regional Consult planning PSU as eight-week countdown has all forces on board. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN

External: Support from the larger community is in evidence as five Clay businesses agree to buy ads for *The Widen Voice* and a local businessman says yes to participating in the upcoming Grill PSU.

Internal: Carpet square sewing party on Saturday night makes for colorful living space as well as promoting collegial atmosphere.

Contradiction: Ensuring that quarterly plan begins to take on practical forms. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Week II Regional Consult PSU sets Consult date, creates implementary maneuvers, timeline and budget. Three metros are represented.

Internal: After week of dispersion the whole House gathers again for Week II PSU, celebrating the success of the 3-1-3-1 rhythm.

Contradiction: Articulating the depth sociological shifts the Regional Consult will address. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Metro roundtable in Harrisburg is a first as circuiters continue to build metro cores

Internal: CYF training weekend with Tom and Pat Price coincides with Youth Trek led by Tim Karpoff and Alice Rose producing a great Phase I Week II for the whole house.

Contradiction: Creating a realistic and concrete timeline for tasks and troops. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: All three metros meet in week highlighted by Washington Metro wrestling through directions of missional focus relative to Ivy City and the Washington Region at large. A new direction is signaled as women use the holiday afforded by Inauguration Day to gather and look at new movement in the women's networks.

Internal: Amidst flurry of inauguration events House welcomes management trek (Doug Allan) and development (Tim Lush).

Contradiction: Turning to region provokes unclear images of covenant between Ivy City and ICA requiring formation of a new consensus that symbolizes victory in Ivy City. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Boston Metro Team studies the Education Proposal in preparation for Education PSU Week 6. Highlight of week is making arrangements for volunteers headed for Pisinemo, Starks and Maharastra.

Internal: Weekend painting job supplies additional cash toward \$1000 heating oil bill. In third week of all-female house, the favorite quote is "Women hold up half (or more of) the sky".

Contradiction: Creating the needed variety of alternative responses to requests for working with the Institute full-time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Community Congress led by community resident has representatives from all project programs and makes exciting plans for winter quarter including annual winter carnival. Community planning groups augmented by Dr. Harry and Ellis Bliss from Portland and David Morton from New Hampshire. Fine circuit to Augusta includes visits to key governmental agency contacts and yields some new contacts and programmatic interest.

Internal: House is pleased to host the Blisses and David Morton for House Church (doubling usual size of House).

Contradiction: Finding the needed funds for cornshop rehabilitation so that tenants can both survive and grow. (Wk.3)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: All members of the area are present at Development PSU. The highlight is the presence of six Montreal colleagues Saturday, with the promise of a core emerging.

Internal: Well-coordinated inkind efforts and effective planning enable awesome ambiance of hope for the new year.

Contradiction: Finding a way to trust what we hear or write down. (Wk.3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: A fine visit is held with the Secretary of Board of Trade. Week II circuits teams, including entire staff, break loose phased image relative to building cores and recruit the Symposium at the same time. Total wall decor of quarter plan continually rehearses the promise.

Internal: A colleague who continually shows up enlivens House and holds promise for Regional leadership.

Contradiction: Building media strategy to care for advocacy while expanding public profile across region. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: One-on-one training event encourages metro colleague to use effective new methodologies at work. Meeting with Pontiac Social Planning Council underlines need and possibility of major training event. New data system moves along another notch as whole House participates in Week II blitz.

Internal: Roundtable sees five guests, including Richard Kitney who arrives to begin national frame maneuver.

Contradiction: Choosing the route without slowing down or waiting for the fog to clear. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: New Year's Eve celebration is time for reflection on past year and launching of first quarter in 1981.

Internal: House returns from discontinuity across the North American continent as New Brunswick experiences coldest weather in 75 years.

Contradiction: Recovering the momentum to launch the year with power and determination. (Wk.1)

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY****HAVANA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Claverty Cottage Consult Review confirms potential for a Blue Mountain Human Development Zone as Claverty evaluates past year and names keystones for 1981. Trinityville core begins to meet weekly in preparation for February CYF. Woburn Lawn preschool electricity is hooked up after community delegation pays visit to Ministry. The Woodwork Shop visits Trinityville Vocational School to learn handling of heavy-duty electrical equipment and shop layout.

Internal: House experiences intensification of guests as three Woburn Lawners attend roundtable and three Rastafarians from Trinityville come to House Church and weekly planning. Pam Shepherd is sent out to begin training with Ministry of Health in Morant Bay.

Contradiction: Articulating public story which releases regional momentum. (Wk.3)

LIMA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: New Year's Eve reflective dinner gives House and village core a way of appropriating 1980 and anticipating 1981 in the context of movemental collegiality. In the midst of auxiliary team discontinuity, Christmas commission plans celebration of the 12th day of Christmas demonstrating operational awareness of planning methods. Lima team and House launch 10-week women's series "Women in Development"; group includes wives of government ministers, company executives, pastors, embassy officials, eager to sort out their effective role in Peru's development.

Internal: After reflection on 10-day Christmas season discontinuity which reveals awareness of the essential "distancing" role that discontinuity plays and the need to teach the method of "using time", quarter auxiliary training and English classes are launched and Randy White and Robert Allan build children's play yard.

Contradiction: Clarifying the role that the HDTI will play in Azpitia intensification, regional expansion and continental interchange. (Wk.1)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Excitement mounts as INCE-IGLESIA and YMCA plug in as cosponsors of the Regional Consult. New York Guardians Keith and Ruth Smiley drop in for a Cano Negro site visit and House Church.

Internal: House views *Human Factor* film with Caracas colleagues and all enjoy a lively bilingual reflection with refreshments afterwards.

Contradiction: Consensing on key thrusts relative to Caracas Regional Consult in the midst of global development. (Wk.3)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: The first developed income of the year arrives — \$1000 from Xerox. The state coordinator for MOBREAL (adult literacy and community action agency) reaffirms his support of Community Forums and will participate in major extension campaign. A representative from Union Carbide visits Bananeiras.

Internal: Quarter planning continues, arriving at a set of maneuvers and priorities for the quarter.

Contradiction: Eliciting full leadership responsibility in Bananeiras in the midst of an intensive Community Forum Campaign. (Wk. 1)

QUARTER III WEEK FIVE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Betty Carter (Greenville, MS Democrat Times) phones to ask address so she can mail her \$50,000 contribution. A "white" week in for all development troops in Chicago includes completion of five proposals, targeting of six corporations per active region for February constituency emphasis, and collegial dinners with Research Centrum and Chicago Area House. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining the momentum of 1980 year-end fiscal victories by holding up the income side of cash flow reports.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that plans for the Order study has been mailed to the houses; the May through December, 1981, Journal is in the print shop to be typeset, and the Roundtable for weeks 9-12 have been sent to the houses. Banners, flags and celebrations punctuate week as six victories are accomplished with a combination of individual responsibility and corporate power. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pacing in effectiveness.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Chicago publishes and sends out band reports, including global calendar and Quarter III and IV assignments for major programs, based on the work brought to the band meeting by each nexus. Brussels prepares an interchange packet with Africa Council and Lamego (Area Madrid) Set reports. Chicago prepares flyer for the International Training Center and begins Academy recruitment with a mailing to 2200. A breakthrough is the global decor design for the Regional Consult with the names of each region around the border to be colored blue as the consults are held. The key contradiction lies in the arena of webbing ongoing programmatic activity with new input from band meetings.

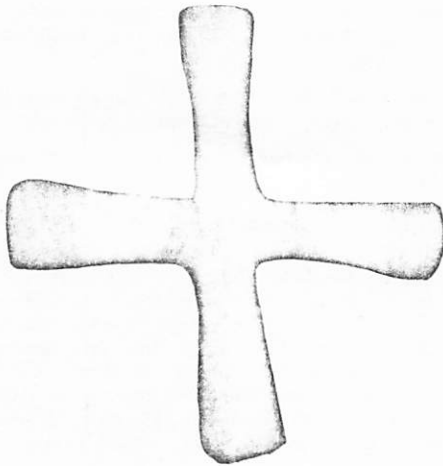
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports the Chicago Nexus journeys through budgeting during the week and through conversion of the International Training Center heating plant from oil to gas, which reduces projected fuel expense by 30%. Financial proficiency is demonstrated through continued experimentation with development of budgeting skills and with awakening of consciousness about budgeting to effect change in the financial situation. The key contradiction lies in the arena of allowing the globe to experience existentially the financial victory of North America in 1980, while the immediate situation would indicate otherwise.

MADRID

Internal: House welcomes Prabakhar and Kathy from Brussels for development trek and one of the translators comes to lunch after helping with development calls.

Contradiction: Using varied contacts as building blocks for solid foundation for movement foundation. (Wk.4)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Volunteer Orientation Weekend-II begins with 17 around the table (13 participants and four staff). Staff for the Weekend includes colleague Sister Maire from Manchester. Circuit highlight for the week is a visit with old metro colleagues, Bob Brown and Dave Wilcox in Oxford.

Internal: London House EG visit colleagues for the weekend to everyone's great enjoyment while help in preparing for the Volunteer Orientation Weekend comes from Guardians and friends.

Contradiction: Learning to live out of and trust story that we have the resources necessary to handle the external demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Glasgow colleagues offer their homes as outposts for the Metro Practicum. Edinburgh colleague sets up Youth Forum for Practicum week. Coca-Cola agrees to provide drinks and cups for the Symposium.

Internal: Local colleague helps in furniture pick up as House gets over 20 phone calls in reply to inkind goods ad in paper. Ed is sent out to Volunteer Orientation Weekend in London.

Internal: Michael Shaw participates as staff in London V.O.W. weekend, and guest night overflows with three Tai'rgwaith village residents for roundtable.

Contradiction: Structuring staff to support shift from a delimited project focus to a regional focus. (Wk. 4)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three nurture lunches at the House prove a winning tactic: representatives from international development organization, Peruvian journalist/professor and local banker all say yes to Regional Consult Symposium. "Special Edition" newsletter is sent, announcing the Consult. First pledge of the year is received from Annual Appeal. The translator of the inkind request letter donates pens, markers, paper and cakes.

Internal: Job offer is accepted with Business and Industry Advisory Committee of O.E.C.D.

Contradiction: Stating the accomplishments without which the Consult and House won't come to fruition. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Three band meeting reports in one week and the Brussels House Guest Night with 14 people including seven Vietnamese boat people creates liveliness. Regional team hosts development guests for lunch and dinner at the Institute.

Internal: House struggles with the function and contents of roundtable and has great event. Brussels House car purchase releases workable car to nexus.

Contradiction: Using space and time design adequately to reflect missional focus and engagement need. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Everyone gets out "on the road" for permeation, self-support, development and local program. All turn up exciting possibilities, colleagues, program and money.

Internal: House rediscovers the excellence of the "Wayside Inn" dynamic in throwing a birthday party and also hosting Paris House for an area check-signals.

Contradiction: Concreteing exciting possibilities before team is dispersed on continental assignments. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Maneuvers toward Regional Consult are initiated in Frankfurt and troops augmented in Berlin for two weeks of push-in participation. Three-day trip to Vienna confirms the format and the recruitment for the Week 7 training weekend. Letter from German sojourner in Maharashtra is received expressing gratitude for the preparation that two months in the House gave her. Two pre-med students spend the day reading HDP materials and announce their intention to work, sojourn for a month and go to a project where they could be useful in June.

Internal: House begins the New Year in planning the Regional Consult maneuvers and internal life with creative and wise participation of Julie Thonon, formally part of Caracas metro cadre, now living and working in Basel, Switzerland.

Contradiction: Finding ways to journey colleagues who are willing to engage quickly enough to meet this week's heavy demands of work, EG care, major deadlines and opportunities in Regional Consult preparation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The House and Brian Williams and Connie Widyatama from development centrum cap the week with 1,500 Gelders in hand and 14,000 working. Framing calls were made to Nederland Council of Churches, colleagues and Indian Ambassador — all were interested and supportive. A volunteer from the Women's Club helps in the office.

Internal: A decision on the five key victories for Region Koln at a Week II ends in writing a Koln song and a German celebration complete with appropriate "props".

Contradiction: Creating a comprehensive story which provides continual missional context for scattered colleagues. (Wk. 5)

External: Dr. Shawky's visit with Governor and Bayad site visit by governor's envoy culminate in active support of Regional Consult. Minya University staff finalize invitations and translate Symposium.

Internal: Bee Nabila Issack's new governorate teaching job opens new structured House relationship proposals.

Contradiction: Inviting necessary participants with Regional Consult three weeks away. (Wk. 5)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Eleven people are sent from the Accra Region to the Ijede HDTs. The Avenorpeme Village Development Cluster (AVDC: Ghana) reports the guilds are organized, land is cleared for a clinic, six demonstration farm plots are set up, stake gridding and baseline data are completed. The German Embassy gives 150,000 cedis (US\$55,000) for hospital construction matched by 10,000 cedis raised locally.

Internal: Steve Hamje is sent out to the Ijede HDTs via Accra.

Contradiction: Guarding the tensional balance of intensive and extensive strategies to release the self-sustained new village movement across the area. (Wk. 3)

Internal: A three-in-one PSU Week II produces ICA journey model, talks on "Intensive/Extensive Strategy" and "Nothinghood", new draft of comprehensive curriculum and cluster consult model.

Contradiction: The vehicle for continuing dialogue over central issues during radical dispersion. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Quarter III planning for the region proves to be a sobering event as the Great Regional Consult Maneuver begins to take shape.

Internal: Justin Morrill visits and adds a global dimension to internal spirit events. Staff participates in the celebration of an Islamic wedding.

Contradiction: Launching the quarter with gusto in the midst of being somewhat intimidated by the scope of events to come. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Pulling chestnuts out of the fire in the next six months without getting badly burned. (Wk. 4)

External: The Global Language School is a great success with nine participants, resulting in new prospects of sojourners, funds, and friends, as well as giving Korean staff participants a boost in English skills. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: LENS calling blitz of 12 companies in Fukuoka nets two registrations for February LENS. GLS recruitment is started as brochure is completed. Kita Kyushu advisors meeting Week 5 is scheduled and location set at Nishi Niha Industrial Club.

Internal: Collegiums outline five-point plan for strongholds, focus and image of six months and volunteer engagement. House says initial Yes to new house and celebrates Idia's fourth birthday.

Contradiction: Planning to do it well and doing it well. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Staff visits 14 companies for March LENS — first two registrations are received. Suami Tanaka becomes first woman Japanese LENS teacher as she travels to Kita Kyushu for its LENS Symposium.

Contradiction: Enabling inter-metro communication and exchange in order to strengthen the solidarity of the regional team of 25 families across the region. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Metro actuation is in full swing as teams take off with proposal brief and fact sheet on *MID-south DIALOGUE: The '80s* in hand, hot off the newly acquired Memphis House press. Thirty-four appointments are set for next two weeks across the region. Sarone Kennedy drops by daily to be on a calling team.

Internal: Unexpected reimbursement for volunteer travel costs with state agency arrives in the mail.

Contradiction: Discerning and daring to ask questions that enable volunteers and colleagues to participate in the mission. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Critical contacts for Consult initiated Week I and three-month journey to Regional Consult is mapped out Week II.

Internal: Robert McKay's week long "Rite of Passage" — gifts, song and scripture, Daily Office witness, *Ronin* readings and youth celebration — culminates in participation as a youth in House quarter planning retreat at Caritas, Abita Springs.

Contradiction: Setting up command post and transiting to new roles, while maintaining ongoing operation at full speed. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: First week of Senior Citizens Town Meetings, funded and assisted by Atlanta Regional Commission, brings

high favor from agency people and excitement from Seniors. Week is climaxed as regional colleagues gather to lay groundwork for Regional Consult, make corporate decisions and plans (far beyond expectations) for the quarter.

Internal: Events of the week, including the new roundtable construct which provides depth spirit for new and old colleagues, bring over 20 people into house as the new space lends itself to good planning and guest accommodation.

Contradiction: Continuing to lay the tracks faster than the train is coming. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Team circuits to Miami doing interviews for Regional Consult. Four guests join the regional team for roundtable. House is impacted with visit of Fred Lamphear on Youth Trek.

Internal: Phase I collegiums allow House to look at high school cluster and prepare for Youth Presidium.

Contradiction: Locating assignable colleagues to help pick up myriad of tasks. (Wk. 5)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Several are sent out from the Nexus to the San Francisco Regional Consult as the next phase of consults is launched. The North American Management modules are completed as troupes return from Areas Edmonton and New York. Sixteen guests attend an Evening at the Institute, and several follow-up appointments result.

Internal: The Phase I are in action as the Student House prepares the fourth floor for the Youth Presidium and the sixth-graders and staff spend a week II checking out possible sites for the Order Summer Camp.

Contradiction: Finding the images, symbols, and systems that hold our clarity that our missional resolve at this time is the Regional Consult. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Second week of Regional Consult interviews in preparation for the Symposium results in interviews held in all 36 polises. The total is 457 persons interviewed in two weeks with 19 regional colleagues setting up and doing interviews. 5th City Preschool Board decides to raise money for two people to participate from the school.

Internal: Chicago Metro roundtable is highlighted by study of GRA Symposium research papers on the economic arena and workshop on naming the panelists wanted to represent the Chicago Region in each sector.

Contradiction: Giving shape to the one event out of many possibilities that the Regional Consult could be. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Kansas City goes on-line to Pittsburgh, giving team access to the ICA data base. Regional team meets in Lorimor sharing various program development breakthroughs, including a format for Church World Missions Day and a new form for Youth Forum. LENS is held this week in Omaha for InterNorth. Lincoln Regional team members plan to meet regularly for House Church.

Internal: With dust flying and piles of trash mounting, the youth spend Saturday earning funds for the upcoming Youth Presidium; in addition, Saturday evening candlelight dinner is becoming a house trend for closing the week on a relaxing, celebrative note.

Contradiction: Directing energies toward external mission rather than immediate internal care considerations. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: LENS presentation is made to the city of Des Moines for pilot neighborhood planning program. Cedar Falls visit and Rotary presentation introduces the Institute to a broad spectrum of Cedar Falls leadership. Iowa hunger task force gives \$5000 for African Village Adoption.

Internal: House sends out Barbara Prather after completion of two month visit, and finds that the highlight of this week's roundtable is discussion about prophet imagination and vision.

Contradiction: Deciding strategy for further community development work. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Minnesota Rural Development Council, composed of most federal and state agencies which serve the state, creates their strategy and priorities using the LENS process. The outcome is three clear directions which is a hitherto unknown kind of consensus in that organization. The event produces eight other new program possibilities within the Minnesota public sector.

Internal: The Phase I Rendezvous successfully stirs up the imagination and resolve of the Minneapolis House Cluster. Through the circuit and the Minneapolis Region debriefing session the entire team, all phases, are anticipating the creation of major new directions at the Youth Presidium and regional planning in February and March.

Contradiction: Conveying the sense of urgency for human development so that it makes sense today regionwide to power structures and citizens. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: PSU lays out timeline and initial battleplan for Regional Consult. First interview begins practical work on target contacts and facility search.

Internal: The "Clean Sweep" maneuver nets a temporary team contract with a Kroger "floor". The Addingtons celebrate death of Nadine's father in Durham, North Carolina, and honor extended family relationships.

Contradiction: Initiating new operating modes for self-support and Regional Consult launch that make logistics imaginably effortless. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Week's circuit impacts regional team with 15 at Hillsdale Metro roundtable. The exciting story of Tecumseh Cities Town Meeting follow through includes a summer youth program, an elders' center and housing, a new civic auditorium to be dedicated debt free on February 15, and plans for an indoor swimming pool to be constructed in 1981 -- all part of the Town Meeting proposals.

Internal: Office gets new look with Regional Consult contact and circuit decor, recycled printing room storage and worktable, and gift of a four-drawer file cabinet.

Contradiction: Taking aim on every target in its turn to make sure every shot counts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Whole metro and specific assignments merge in four operating arenas, built from Regional Consult and council thrust. Metro guilds start work after metro council with activities in neighborhoods, training events and circuits. Youth Forum is being set up with Cory United Methodist Church.

Internal: Roundtable is held in Columbus, and Cleveland initiates regional circuits in grand style. As new black Academy grad begins three-month sojourn at House, a retired school teacher calls to say she is ready to go anywhere in the world to work in villages.

Contradiction: Clarifying priorities in midst of many demands. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Metro Council, with 24 adults and 10 Emerging Generation participating, results in six maneuvers to implement regional priorities discerned during the Regional Consult.

Internal: Youth Cluster is invited out to high school teacher's home for dinner in appreciation for cluster's contribution to classroom community.

Contradiction: Keeping our working and symbolic decor up to date and life giving. (Wk. 3)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Regional meeting concerning the Regional Consult reports 7,700 Regional Consult brochures printed, 1,700 mailed, and 58 interviews held to date. Twenty-two paid registrations are in hand with seven weeks to go.

Internal: Doug Allan visits on Management Module, impacting House timeline.

Contradiction: Getting key people to sign on the dotted line. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Hostage return impacts roundtable at Armours'. Alan Crain spreads his enthusiasm for Maliwada and shares the impact of the Maliwada House prior on his life with the circuit team. Inked victories of offset plates for CEM document and Gestafax stencils for Regional Consult are received. Annual Appeal report and thank-yous are sent to regional donors.

Internal: House appreciates helpful images provided by Training Post Collegium I on formation.

Contradiction: Ensuring maximum regional team participation in Regional Consult planning PSU as eight-week countdown has all forces on board. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN

External: Coraopolis youth host eight Widen youth and chaperone family for weekend in Pittsburgh. Appointments with Extension Service and Methodist bishop open doors for Regional Consult support. Local resident travels with auxiliary to lumber company inking materials for community gameroom renovation.

Internal: Top of the Triangle celebration in the US Steel Building in Pittsburgh symbolizes commitment to do the region.

Contradiction: Mobilizing regional resources to effect a miracle rather than just doing tactics. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional Consult PSU decisions, maneuvers and timeline breaks loose week of actuation as Regional Consult brochures arrive from New York, Chicago and San Francisco. Albany and Binghamton Metros begin framing tactics. Development Centrum team arrives to help in the creation of funding plan and first appointments.

Internal: Regional Consult PSU provides occasion for third regional team meeting for the month — three strong metros represented — and for keeping all expenses (except postage) to a minimum while maintaining full missional effectivity.

Contradiction: Creating the pennant which rallies the troops to the battlefield! (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Metro roundtable in Harrisburg is a first as circuiters continue to build metro cores.

Internal: CYF training weekend with Tom and Pat Price coincides with Youth Trek led by Tim Karpoff and Alice Rose producing a great Phase I Week II for the whole house.

Contradiction: Creating a realistic and concrete timeline for tasks and troops. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Jeremy Rifkin, author of *Entropy*, keeps staff and an invited audience entranced with his assaults on many of their assumptions about "the way it is", as he shares himself at an evening benefit for the Ivy City community.

Internal: Staff assists Mike Vosler in symbolizing the transition into his third great lifetime with a surprise party.

Contradiction: Symbolizing and coordinating the emerging consensus through inclusive implementation teams in Ivy City. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Boston Metro Team studies the Education Proposal in preparation for Education PSU Week 6. Highlight of week is making arrangements for volunteers headed for Pisinemo, Starks and Maharastra.

Internal: Weekend painting job supplies additional cash toward \$1000 heating oil bill. In third week of all-female house, the favorite quote is "Women hold up half (or more of) the sky".

Contradiction: Creating the needed variety of alternative responses to requests for working with the Institute full-time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: One inked tractor scoop of sand almost squashes inked pickup truck before delivery to old cornshop as part of foundation for new chimney. Three state agencies colleagues initiate regular guild meeting. Appointments are set for exploring CYF proposal.

Internal: Arrival of two youth, Joni Fleischman and Janet Molzan from Indianapolis, is occasion for tour of Starks, slides and an evening celebration.

Contradiction: Turning shifting sands into cement. (Wk. 5)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Quebec circuit opens three new networks — Carrefour Tiers Monde, Institut Technologique Agricole, and Pastorale Sociale. One-day training event for the regional executive of the Cercle des Fermieres, a 70,000 plus Quebec Women's organization, is set for March 11. Webster Foundation gives \$5000.

Internal: Marnie Ellis, new colleague from Business and Professional Women's Club, brings complete meal to roundtable, attended by 11 people from six nations, two of whom attend for first time. Marguerite Fisher's parents visit from Saskatchewan.

Contradiction: Clarifying directions in midst of the explosion of possibilities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: A fine visit is held with the Secretary of Board of Trade. Week II circuits teams, including entire staff, break loose phased image relative to building cores and recruit the Symposium at the same time. Total wall decor of quarter plan continually rehearses the promise.

Internal: A colleague who continually shows up enlivens House and holds promise for regional leadership.

Contradiction: Building media strategy to care for advocacy while expanding public profile across region. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: NVO Conference participation connects with largest network of volunteer groups in the nation and opens up development, framing and program opportunities. An adhoc group concerned with getting Constitutional issues to the grass roots level holds a breakfast meeting.

Internal: Yosts 35th wedding Anniversary, with a fine dinner at one of the historic landmarks of Ottawa, provides an opportunity for everyone to participate in the honoring of family and covenantal relationships.

Contradiction: Seeing the whole picture of the Regional Consult. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Well company drills 200-foot well without charge on newly acquired land for agriculture demonstration-training site, as another step toward preparing farmers for mass agro-irrigation program. Training center has foundation laid and all necessary materials are on hand ready for construction. The reports of Fernando Compos and the Rivas family to the community about U.S. Projects elicits many comments about Conacaste completion and questions about possibilities of internship.

Internal: George and Donna return from working Honeymoon in Mexico; Rivas expand the auxiliary to 12 until they leave for next assignment in Lima, Peru.

Contradiction: Weaving training, action and expansion into a smooth flowing rhythm. (Wk. 1)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Industries come alive as 800 electrical outlets are produced in one week and wicker handicraft catalogue is prepared. Garro visits wicker Wonderland owner and receives initial contract agreement. House team leads workshop on indicative planning method and shows global film at National Housing Trust Training Seminar. Co-op Farm Workday builds shed for storing fertilizer and does road work.

Internal: Larry Ward is sent out to Caracas for Continental development strike force assignment.

Contradiction: Planning in such a way that urgency of long-range issues is revealed and dealt with. (Wk. 4)

LIMA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Steady work by Azpitia residents on access road is highlighted by completion of the final bridge and an agreement with residents of the neighboring community for completing the work. Breakthroughs in effectively employ- forces beyond those of the auxiliary is signaled by development team (including a bi-lingual Azpitian and a bi-lingual secretary) who are ready to volunteer "after hours" time; executives wives and wives of ambassadors and government ministers doing recruitment for Women's Series; and Lima cadre recruiting and planning to teach methods course.

Internal: Sacred space is just about complete, demonstrating the possibility of creating tranquility and a place for reflection in the midst of the action centrum.

Contradiction: Deciding the most effective strategy for playing the networks to produce the HDTS. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: The Barlovento Human Development Team meets with full representation from three villages for the first time in Juan Diaz after week of visiting villages for commitment from eight villages to representation at the Human Development Conference. (Regional Consult) Setup for the Consult gains momentum with housing in six metros, brochures out to all four sectors. Annual Appeal begins in Area Caracas.

Internal: Global Development Team arrives; Toyota mechanic and cat veterinary services are inkinded.

Contradiction: Focusing Regional Consult recruitment with strategic coverage of the four sectors. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Channel 13 TV (the station that does Chile's Telethon for handicapped children) spends all day Wednesday filming feature program of Sol de Septiembre. Film crew is so impacted by singing of Ninos del Sol that they burst into applause. Village participates in preparation and eventful day with great pride, dignity and spirit.

Internal: Now that the auxiliary is all under one roof for first time in Sol's history, it works on space and time designs which will release its spirit and energies to engage in the expanding external tasks.

Contradiction: Moving into unknown future wisely and with confidence. (Wk. 3)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Three community Forums are setup on succeeding days. Bananeiras storekeeper decides to be distributor for medicines in community. Rio businessman commits himself to paying expenses for forums in Recife.

Internal: Roundtable begins with fanfare and great delight in construct; House does Forum training refining and polishing construct.

Contradiction: Keeping up with maneuvers for quarter in doing all details overagainst "winning" them. (Wk. 4)

THE GLOBAL ORDER CENTRUM REPORT

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports \$12,600 USD from Union Carbide, India. Brussels meets January bottomline early and then welcomes Amsterdam circuit back with \$2,500 in hand. Chicago closes out a low January, then receives a \$50,000 check and two \$10,000 checks the first week of February. Extensive appointments in Kuala Lumpur provides good working base; Sir James and Lady Lindsay's trip to India produces 11 major industrialists for exposition steering committee; Chicago spends week in writing proposals and creating the February corporation/foundation emphasis. The key contradiction lies in the arena of practically engaging both new and old authorization to give momentum to the task.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports band personel return from band meeting and hit road in Europe to launch Regional Consults. The 6 Edge PSU's ready for going into the Global Research net. Being on the roost with RegionaI Consults and other research demands calls for forging of common missional image and thrust for all troops. The contradiction lies in the arena of the configuration of forces to maintain one task over a variety of thrusts and to overcome the gap between the significant program impact results of regional activities and our capacity to document the story of what has been accomplished.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports from Bombay that troops return jubilant from first Regional Consult setup trek with location and sponsorship tied down. In Brussels a team is sent to the Berlin Regional Consult and in Chicago momentum builds for consults as San Francisco and Caracas are underway. Community Youth Forum is the format for Leadership Day program held at Hales Franciscan Boys High School in Chicago. The whole student body participates. This was a unique event that was planned and organized by student pressure and was the highlight of Hale's Homecoming week. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building the ongoing plans that backup holes that appear as troops are dispersed.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports all North American Houses have completed management module. US AID auditor visits Singapore Nexus. December OE report is done on new report form in Brussels. Tax exemption status requires 4 years income tax returns and renewal forms submitted in Delhi. Centrum sends out P. Penna and A. Rakade to do two-day module in nine regional houses in Area Bombay. Receipt of Nairobi checkbook and OE records for August-December signal expansion of care for African continent. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating a screen for prioritizing the many events planned.

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Development week is highlighted by a two-hour call with the Swiss manager of an American multinational and three companies who request second meetings to arrange for funds. Trip to Valencia opens doors to "barrios" around the city and initiates a structural relationship with Ford through their agreeing to publish an article in their magazine about Encuentro Comunitario.

Internal: Weekend PSU on Regional Consult puts House on top of major arenas of preparation, aided by wisdom of regional colleagues. Collegium on the Moors in Spain provides added historical perspective.

Contradiction: Focussing in on the Regional Consult to "Dream the Impossible Dream" relative to engagement. (Wk. 5)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Focus of the week is writing the third draft of the Volunteer Orientation Weekend. Invitations for Guest Night are mailed and House hosts group leader interested in linking with an HDP village in India.

Internal: Hosting of Patterson relatives from Canada is not only fun but motivating as a generous hostelry fee is added to the sale of the little, old "Fiat" and staff meets week's self-support budget.

Contradiction: Transforming large wall calendar so it holds both the tension of area and continental events and the implementing steps. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Glasgow colleagues offer their homes as outposts for the Metro Practicum. Edinburgh colleague sets up Youth Forum for Practicum week. Coca-Cola agrees to provide drinks and cups for the Symposium.

This is what is wrong in all that is done here under the sun: that one and the same fate befalls every man. Contradiction: Ensuring both program support and self-support victory with limited financial options. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Swansea Metro research week organizes metro and project files, creates comprehensive framing chart and gives a first-hand look at Swansea and the Burrough of Llui Valley. Management Committee uses workshop methods to see their way around the rock in the middle of the road — community involvement.

Internal: House PSU clarifies set, zone and project strategy for February; Bill wins at TWC Bingo and also receives job offer.

Contradiction: Clarifying claims and resources in relation to area mission. (Wk. 5)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three nurture lunches at the House prove a winning tactic: representatives from international development organization, Peruvian journalist/professor and local banker all say yes to Regional Consult Symposium. "Special Edition" newsletter is sent, announcing the Consult. First pledge of the year is received from Annual Appeal. The translator of the inkind request letter donates pens, markers, paper and cakes.

Internal: Job offer is accepted with Business and Industry Advisory Committee of O.E.C.D.

Contradiction: Stating the accomplishments without which the Consult and House won't come to fruition. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Three band meeting reports in one week and the Brussels House Guest Night with 14 people including seven Vietnamese boat people creates liveliness. Regional team hosts development guests for lunch and dinner at the Institute.

Internal: House struggles with the function and contents of roundtable and has great event. Brussels House car purchase releases workable car to nexus.

Contradiction: Using space and time design adequately to reflect missional focus and engagement need. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Everyone gets out "on the road" for permeation, self-support, development and local program. All turn up exciting possibilities, colleagues, program and money.

Internal: House rediscovers the excellence of the "Wayside Inn" dynamic in throwing a birthday party and also hosting Paris House for an area check-signals.

Contradiction: Concretizing exciting possibilities before team is dispersed on continental assignments. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two great events happen in one weekend — a two-day planning retreat for Ludwigshafen inner city church council and an Evening at the Institute in Wittlich (Koblenz Metro) for 22 people. New format newsletter is mailed and meetings and appointments are held with Regional Consult preparation emphasis. House sends four to participate in Symposium of the Berlin Regional Consult.

Internal: Old plaster dust, new paint fumes and teams of workmen take over the house as internal renovation becomes a daily occurrence.

Contradiction: Uniting the calling approach and corporate brooding to enable confident breakthrough into new terrain of Frankfurt structures. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The "Dutch Face" becomes more visible as three local volunteers say yes to regular work with translation and office work. Jan Joosten stops in to help build strategies for the Regional Consult and stays till midnight talking about the foundations of the ICA.

Internal: Three Vietnamese guests at roundtable enthral staff with tales of flight from their homeland three months ago. The House is then invited to join the 150 other Vietnamese in community here to celebrate the New Year Tet with food, drink, fireworks and much dramatic mythology to welcome the Year of the Chicken.

Contradiction: Moving into the future with too many assumptions relative to participants, places and dates. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: The Regional Consult occasions significant visits in public, private, voluntary and local sectors and reveals numerous opportunities for new style of programming.

Internal: The House visits the Berlin Museum to broaden context and deepen understanding of city.

Contradiction: Discerning the learnings from the past five years' work to release the development of the movemental order core. (Wk. 3)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: The House delivers brochures on two religious order consultations to be held in Quarter IV to 150 religious order generalates. The "All Roads Lead to Rome" maneuvers for an intensive framing push on government, church and legal are thought through and launched. An invitation to a Club of Rome luncheon results in many new English-speaking contacts in business.

Internal: Brussels Nexus arrives in the form of Operations and Development to enable the House to find a new facility and to broaden movement contacts.

Contradiction: Solving the here and now problem of housing for staging towards the longrange solution. (Wk. 4)

STOCKHOLM

Contradiction: Discerning the pillars of training for local facilitators when our consensus and decision-making and workshopping methods are urgently being requested. (Wk. 4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Dr. Shawky's visit with Governor and Bayad site visit by governor's envoy culminate in active support of Regional Consult. Minya University staff finalize invitations and translate Symposium.

Internal: Bee Nabila Issack's new governorate teaching job opens new structured House relationship proposals.

Contradiction: Inviting necessary participants with Regional Consult three weeks away. (Wk. 5)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Eleven people are sent from the Accra Region to the Ijede HDTS. The Avenorpeme Village Development Cluster (AVDC: Ghana) reports the guilds are organized, land is cleared for a clinic, six demonstration farm plots are set up, stake gridding and baseline data are completed. The German Embassy gives 150,000 cedis (US\$55,000) for hospital construction matched by 10,000 cedis raised locally.

Internal: Steve Hamje is sent out to the Ijede HDTS via Accra.

Contradiction: Guarding the tensional balance of intensive and extensive strategies to release the self-sustained new village movement across the area. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: As the opening day draws near, construction of pillars on the second facility is completed and more attention is directed to raising funds by having a twelve hour long PSU on development. The ICA office locates in a new building. Arrival of a new Toyota Landcruiser, which encountered an elephant on the way, reduces transport problem.

Internal: Vernon and Applegate arrive from Bombay and Iowa respectively, and House does first HDTS roundtable experiment which proves to be easy to understand.

Contradiction: Keeping community focus on opening of school to enable the servant struggle by the community. (Wk. 3)

Internal: A dinner reception for the Lindsays at the nexus calls for a week-long renovation event — painted kitchen, bathrooms and hall, new porch furniture and beautiful curtains — gives our "lovely home" (Lady Lindsay's words) a great new look. Three sojourners from Britain are key renovators.

Contradiction: Releasing enough resources to equip ashrams with basic housing materials and essentials tools and formats. (Wk. 4)

External: Arrival of television set demonstrates government's ability to move quickly and opens up a new era of training with programs on cattle raising and family planning. Hyderabad circuit begins follow up work from Regional Consult.

Internal: First collegium of series on the nine continents expands auxiliary's context of the globe, and three-week training plan for English and Telegu lessons is created.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the decision to take total responsibility for creating village victories. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Circuit to Patna secures four Hindi CYFs for Week 8. Visits by Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay lead to Rs 12 lakhs working for MHDP Phase III, five requests to do HDPs, six LENS secured and church authorization with local Archbishop and Mother Theresa. First Guardians meeting of the year grounds the team in the local frame.

Internal: House hosts the Lindsays and colleagues Mary D'Souza, Stanley Gibson and John Patterson and participates in a week of overwhelming engagement celebrated by two days of discontinuity.

Contradiction: Using strategically the outcome of the Lindsays' visit to move beyond Regional Consult and strengthen the movement base to focus on new directions. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Kuala Lumpur cross-centrum blitz raises funds to set up Regional Consults. Twenty-five women from different groups participate in GWF in K.L. on 25th January, 1981.

Internal: Hillary, Christopher and Mr. J. S. Dethe highlight week of visitors in addition to great collegiums on Women's PSU and "hope beyond hope".

Contradiction: The vehicle for continuing dialogue over central issues during radical dispersion. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Highlight of the week is a glorious GWF attended by some of the finest women of the public, private and voluntary sectors in Kuala Lumpur. Malay, Chinese and Indian women are present. A training session with employees of Texas Instruments proves again that the private sector is eager for engagement.

Internal: Staff enjoys the visit of Eunice Shankland on area trek and makes good use of her talents as a training construct builder.

Contradiction: Keeping abreast of on-going program and operational demands and using them to advantage on countdown toward Regional Consult. (Wk. 4)

Follow-up circuit to Tanjung Pura Sub-District villages that have had assemblies reports most villages are implementing their major proposal.

Internal: Significant brooding on helpful internal studies that will enable the journey of all staff produces a plan to study "Build, Brother, Build" by Martin L. King, "The Third Wave" and the series of papers by Joe Mathews on "Taking Care of Yourself".

Contradiction: Overcoming the dependency of cluster leadership on ICA staff. (Wk. 3)

External: Two House members participate in first LENS in Aceh Providence at the university and two key LENS are set up out of nine pre-set appointments. Typesetting for national brochure is inkinded as the dome is placed on the village mosque, almost complete after only five weeks of work. Research continues for Indonesian entity.

Internal: Highlights include a new parking space as rainy season floods make road almost impassable, a Phase I pie-

eating contest winner, a first pair of glasses and send out of Eunice to Malaysia to teach GWF.

Contradiction: Using the Regional Consult to schedule strategic use of time and troops. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Bontoa and Tangkuru preschool teachers travel with staff for overnight stay in Sabanga, cluster village near the sea. They train two new teachers and demonstrate preschool for 28 children. Contradiction: Pulling chestnuts out of the fire in the next six months without getting badly burned. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The Global Language School is a great success with nine participants, resulting in new prospects of sojourners, funds, and friends, as well as giving Korean staff participants a boost in English skills. Thirty Town Meetings are set up in Chang Chung Bung Do (province). Korea Development Bank requests ICA assistance in setting up two-month live-in English language school.

External: LENS calling blitz of 12 companies in Fukuoka nets two registrations for February LENS. GLS recruitment is started as brochure is completed. Kita Kyushu advisors meeting Week 5 is scheduled and location set at Nishi Niha Industrial Club.

Internal: Collegiums outline five-point plan for strongholds, focus and image of six months and volunteer engagement. House says initial Yes to new house and celebrates Idia's fourth birthday.

Contradiction: Planning to do it well and doing it well. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Fear and fascination of the Regional Consult sets in as regional colleagues practice interviewing each other and lay out detailed timeline, covering all fronts, for the Consult.

Internal: The House is full again for "Ur Celebration" where all six urs are represented with food, dress, decor, traditions and songs.

Contradiction: Keeping the "see-saw" moving up and down. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Site visit to Pace HDP last year by Rev. McGee nets a demonstration Town Meeting with local neighborhood group. He is planning to attend the GRA this summer because of what he saw in Pace.

Internal: Reorganizing contents of 12 file drawers holds promise of easily accessible data in near future. Sushila Joshi spends the week in hospital as patient instead of nurse.

Contradiction: Putting immediate concerns on a scale of priorities and building the weekly plan which allows fewer troops to do more. (Wk. 6)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: A CYF is held at Hale Franciscan High School (a black school on the South side of Chicago). All 400 students and all faculty participate; the principal describes the forum as one of the most important events for the school in the past 14 years. The Second Annual Youth Presidium on the North American continent begins with 75 present.

Internal: The first, second and third graders took a three-day trip to Springfield, Illinois to visit numerous historical sites. They spent two nights in inkinded rooms at the Holiday Inn. The House participated in several Valentine's parties and the one-day fast.

Contradiction: Anticipating the intensification of demands blocks images of focusing priorities, configuring troops, developing motivating methods and phasing tasks to allow concrete victories while dealing with all demands. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Regional team interviews now total 632 persons interviewed in all 36 polises of Chicago Region.

Internal: "I Am Special" night is held for EG; Jonathan Troxel and Tad Mueller receive T-shirts and give six-point plans on how they will improve their school performance.

Contradiction: Turning warm bodies into cold cash for the Symposium. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Kansas City goes on-line to Pittsburgh, giving team access to the ICA data base. Regional team meets in Lorimor sharing various program development breakthroughs, including a format for Church World Missions Day and a new form for Youth Forum. LENS is held this week in Omaha for InterNorth. Lincoln Regional team members plan to meet regularly for House Church.

Internal: With dust flying and piles of trash mounting, the youth spend Saturday earning funds for the upcoming Youth Presidium; in addition, Saturday evening candlelight dinner is becoming a house trend for closing the week on a relaxing, celebrative note.

Contradiction: Directing energies toward external mission rather than immediate internal care considerations. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR**

External: The first corporation LENS in the region, held at Inter North in Omaha, is well received. State of Iowa Department of Health accepts LENS proposal. Lincoln Metro focuses on methods training and signals beginning of metro team responsibility.

Internal: November and December finance forms are completed and submitted.

Contradiction: Clarifying the rest of the quarter's tactics and the specific six-month objectives. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The second all-day session on Structural Permeation yields the first draft of a permeation mandate and the beginning of a timeline for indepth research. An all-out effort to market programs to service organizations and voluntary sector concerns has yielded a surprising openness in educational structures and one demonstration PSU is already scheduled with St. Paul's Central High School. MnDOT requests and receives a proposal for eight PSUs and a LENS with a pilot district, to involve maintenance crews and supervisors in problem-solving and to train them in PSU methods.

Internal: Regional team is enticed into going to the opera where *Tosca* is brilliantly supported by a choir in which Dr. Lewis Pierce is a first row participant.

Contradiction: Stimulating the interchange across permeation labs which is crucial to a priority which is late in coming to the forefront. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: The week begins with facility hunt. Three locations are nailed down — RS-I in St. Louis, CS-III A in Springfield and the Regional Symposium at Washington University. Regional team does presentation in Muscatine, Iowa, at the church that has adopted Male HDP.

Internal: The week is filled with everyone working on self-support (temporary and full-time) and it is celebrated with 20 people at House Church.

Contradiction: Creating the images that generate momentum to sustain the day-to-day effort until June. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Week's circuit impacts regional team with 15 at Hillsdale Metro roundtable. The exciting story of Tecumseh Cities Town Meeting follow through includes a summer youth program, an elders' center and housing, a new civic auditorium to be dedicated debt free on February 15, and plans for an indoor swimming pool to be constructed in 1981 — all part of the Town Meeting proposals.

Internal: Office gets new look with Regional Consult contact and circuit decor, recycled printing room storage and worktable, and gift of a four-drawer file cabinet.

Contradiction: Taking aim on every target in its turn to make sure every shot counts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Profound Humanness Seminar in Columbus, Ohio, attended by 23 regional colleagues, provides opportunity for helpful reflection on commitment to life of service. Seminar marks first time this program is offered at regional level and is preview of a new course on profound commitment.

Internal: Roundtable "muse" on *Left Hand of Darkness* enables grounding of the dialogue necessary for prophecy.

Contradiction: Turning the corner from comprehensive planning to practical action. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Metro Council, with 24 adults and 10 Emerging Generation participating, results in six maneuvers to implement regional priorities discerned during the Regional Consult.

Internal: Youth Cluster is invited out to high school teacher's home for dinner in appreciation for cluster's contribution to classroom community.

Contradiction: Keeping our working and symbolic decor up to date and life giving. (Wk. 3)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Regional meeting concerning the Regional Consult reports 7,700 Regional Consult brochures printed, 1,700 mailed, and 58 interviews held to date. Twenty-two paid registrations are in hand with seven weeks to go.

Internal: Doug Allan visits on Management Module, impacting House timeline.

Contradiction: Getting key people to sign on the dotted line. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Hostage return impacts roundtable at Armours'. Alan Crain spreads his enthusiasm for Maliwada and shares the impact of the Maliwada House prior on his life with the circuit team. Inkind victories of offset plates for CEM document and Gestafax stencils for Regional Consult are received. Annual Appeal report and thank-yous are sent to regional donors.

Internal: House appreciates helpful images provided by Training Post Collegium I on formation.

Contradiction: Ensuring maximum regional team participation in Regional Consult planning PSU as eight-week countdown has all forces on board. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN

External: Community holds fine workday to create gameroom in the back of the Grill Building. Regional Consult Planning PSU draws five colleagues from three metros and all House personnel (who live in three different metros) to launch a fine Regional Consult event. Beckley circuit nets first two Regional Consult registrations.

Internal: New maps arrive for new regional decor and management trek yields workable three faceted system.

Contradiction: Releasing bold imaginations now so that bold programs occur in spring. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROGHESTER

External: Regional Consult PSU decisions, maneuvers and timeline break loose week of actuation as Regional Consult brochures arrive from New York, Chicago and San Francisco. Albany and Binghamton Metros begin framing tactics. Development Centrum team arrives to help in the creation of funding plan and first appointments.

Internal: Regional Consult PSU provides occasion for third regional team meeting for the month — three strong metros represented — and for keeping all expenses (except postage) to a minimum while maintaining full missional effectivity.

Contradiction: Creating the pennant which rallies the troops to the battlefield! (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Week II program tracking sensitizes Scranton circuit to the implementaries necessary for movement formation and illuminates marketing strategies for CYF.

Internal: House experiences an exciting breakthrough as Management Trek dispels unclarity surrounding finances and reveals the profound care foundational to the systems.

Contradiction: Caring for local cores in the Area signs so that they can support regional development. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Jeremy Rifkin, author of *Entropy*, keeps staff and an invited audience entranced with his assaults on many of their assumptions about "the way it is", as he shares himself at an evening benefit for the Ivy City community.

Internal: Staff assists Mike Vosler in symbolizing the transition into his third great lifetime with a surprise birthday party.

Contradiction: Symbolizing and coordinating the emerging consensus through inclusive implementation teams in Ivy City. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: The Conacaste Connection is busy as John does presentation at Rollins College in Orlando on his

way back from Depauw's second trip to Conacaste. Regional minister of Disciples of Christ in Arizona calls and wants to visit Conacaste, and Roy Chamberlain's church in Brookline sees slides and begins to work on HDP participation. Update and RS-I brochures are sent to 160 families. Cadre at Northfield-Mt. Hermon School meets to plan their next strategic moves including carload to RS-I and team to HDP for spring vacation.

Internal: Money is the theme with management trek (Doug Allan) and extra jobs painting an apartment and doing warehouse inventory in an uphill fight to whip self-support.

Contradiction: Articulating a winning self-support scheme. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: One inkinded tractor scoop of sand almost squashes inkinded pickup truck before delivery to old cornshop as part of foundation for new chimney. Colleagues from three state agencies initiate regular guild meeting. Appointments are set for exploring CYF proposal.

Internal: Arrival of two youth, Joni Fleischman and Janet Molzan from Indianapolis, is occasion for tour of Starks, slides and an evening celebration.

Contradiction: Turning shifting sands into cement. (Wk. 5)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Quebec circuit opens three new networks — Carrefour Tiers Monde, Institut Technologique Agricole, and Pastorale Sociale. One-day training event for the regional executive of the Cercle des Fermieres, a 70,000 plus Quebec Women's organization, is set for March 11. Webster Foundation gives \$5000.

Internal: Marnie Ellis, new colleague from Business and Professional Women's Club, brings complete meal to roundtable, attended by 11 people from six nations, two of whom attend for first time. Marguerite Fisher's parents visit from Saskatchewan.

Contradiction: Clarifying directions in midst of the explosion of possibilities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: A fine visit is held with the Secretary of Board of Trade. Week II circuits teams, including entire staff, break loose phased image relative to building cores and recruit the Symposium at the same time. Total wall decor of quarter plan continually rehearses the promise.

Internal: A colleague who continually shows up enlivens House and holds promise for regional leadership.

Contradiction: Building media strategy to care for advocacy while expanding public profile across region. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: NVO Conference participation connects with largest network of volunteer groups in the nation and opens up development, framing and program opportunities. An adhoc group concerned with getting Constitutional issues to the grass roots level holds a breakfast meeting.

Internal: Yosts 35th wedding Anniversary, with a fine dinner at one of the historic landmarks of Ottawa, provides an opportunity for everyone to participate in the honoring of family and covenantal relationships.

Contradiction: Seeing the whole picture of the Regional Consult. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: House "pressure cooker" stewing session on Monday results in successful framing. Development calls on Wednesday with mammoth lead refinery and coop federation result in Regional Consult being sponsored and funded, three months of circuits paid for and self-support covered for five months. Development mailing goes out to 100 companies.

Internal: Lorne core meets to make critical review of Regional Consult proposal and gives authorization to proceed. Novel snowshoes and sees first hockey game.

Contradiction: Putting the breakthroughs of this week onto a quarter schedule that releases staff practically week by week. (Wk. 4)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Industries come alive as 800 electrical outlets are produced in one week and wicker handicraft catalogue is prepared. Garro visits wicker Wonderland owner and receives initial contract agreement. House team leads workshop on indicative planning method and shows global film at National Housing Trust Training Seminar. Co-op Farm Workday builds shed for storing fertilizer and does road work.

Internal: Larry Ward is sent out to Caracas for Continental development strike force assignment.

Contradiction: Planning in such a way that urgency of long-range issues is revealed and dealt with. (Wk. 4)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Agreement with Government Planning Agency for financing work on the road and the canal system is finalized in a meeting between officials and residents of Azpitia.

Internal: Fifteen guests, including Raphael Davila and members of the Lima cadre and the Lima Women's Course, converge in Azpitia to visit, plan the methods course, project the training school and celebrate the spirit of it all.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the energies of scattered troops to meet the demands of an expanding task. (Wk. 4)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: The Barlovento Human Development Team meets with full representation from three villages for the first time in Juan Diaz after week of visiting villages for commitment from eight villages to representation at the Human Development Conference. (Regional Consult) Setup for the Consult gains momentum with housing in six metros, brochures out to all four sectors. Annual Appeal begins in Area Caracas.

Internal: Global Development Team arrives; Toyota mechanic and cat veterinary services are inkinded.

Contradiction: Focusing Regional Consult recruitment with strategic coverage of the four sectors. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Channel 13 TV (the station that does Chile's Telethon for handicapped children) spends all day Wednesday filming feature program of Sol de Septiembre. Film crew is so impacted by singing of Ninos del Sol that they burst into applause. Village participates in preparation and eventful day with great pride, dignity and spirit.

Internal: Now that the auxiliary is all under one roof for first time in Sol's history, it works on space and time designs which will release its spirit and energies to engage in the expanding external tasks.

Contradiction: Moving into unknown future wisely and with confidence. (Wk. 3)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Three community Forums are setup on succeeding days. Bananeiras storekeeper decides to be distributor for medicines in community. Rio businessman commits himself to paying expenses for forums in Recife.

Internal: Roundtable begins with fanfare and great delight in construct; House does Forum training refining and polishing construct.

Contradiction: Keeping up with maneuvers for quarter in doing all details overagainst "winning" them. (Wk. 4)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that development totals in the Philippines and Hong Kong result in a record-breaking four weeks; while in Europe, Belgium circuiting releases promise of high-level introductions to break loose individual donors. A \$250,000 proposal is submitted to Kiesge Foundation for ITC Renovation over the signature of Don Moffet, Vice President of ICA Board, U.S. In Area Houston there is a shower of blessings via long-range targeting and consistent care-filled nurture. Breakthroughs include newfound individual donor support in Europe and the fact that Regional Consult interviews are opening new doors to a broad constituency of potential support. The key contradiction lies in the arena of generating and maintaining the momentum of gifts from traditional sources in light of economic uncertainty in Europe, unidentified leverage points in Asia and North America and the need to pre-sell new programs before the philanthropic community is ready to support them.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Brussels calls all eleven houses in 24 hours on Fortnight recruitment, Regional Consults, Guardians and Interchange. Hong Kong writes "New Essentialism" talking paper. Chicago launches the six Edge PSUs in Area Montreal, sends out ritual experiment packet and works with Phase I on Youth Revolution PSU. Brussels learns that having a Regional Consult transforms a house's mission from scattered activity to a crisply prioritized regional thrust while Chicago breaks through on new methodology on the Youth Revolution PSU. The key contradiction lies in the arena of tarbabies — like the Fortnight, *IMAGE*, roundtable, materials and July '81 balloons — making the grasping other arenas very sticky.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that a LENS graduate from the Philippines accepts position in Hong Kong and sets up LENS the first week on the job. The Youth Presidium is a powerful event at Chicago Nexus with 60 youth from across North America attending. Academy recruitment network is in full operation as new Regional Consult newsletter is prepared. Practical tactics for setting up Regional Consults are being shared from region to region. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining the extensive and intensive thrust.

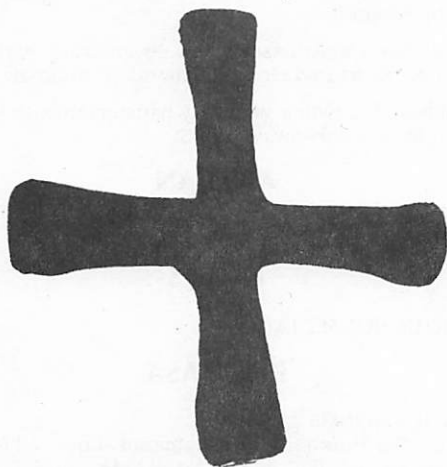
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Jaime Vergara passes by on way from Africa to Chicago.

Contradiction: Keeping "in the chute" for the Regional Consult. (Wk. 5)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: ICA Charitable Trust Board Meeting is held in the London House. It receives reports of Regional Consults and the Volunteer Service Program, accepts Sir James Lindsay as new Board Member and amends Constitution of the Trust to enable ICA to be internationally represented on the Board without specifying the particular office/nation. Two grads from the January Volunteer Orientation Weekend write to say they are ready to work with ICA.

Internal: House hosts seven guests for an Evening at the Institute and welcomes John Patterson back after five weeks of fabulous breakopen trekking in India with Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay.

Contradiction: Experiencing the fullness of demands and opportunities as exhilarating yet longing for that "pause" to ensure the energy to go all the way. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Symposium mailing produces numerous responses, the key one being the General Secretary of the YMCA Glasgow who asks to become a member of ICA and offers the free use of his central Glasgow facility (at anytime) plus program activity in seven deprived areas of Glasgow.

External: Global film showing to Newport Ladies' Guild creates additional opening for second showing to youth group plus visit to Tai'rgwaith in the spring. District social worker visits to discuss district youth summer program. Two guest nights with six guests update village neighbors and local school teachers on the project and our work.

Internal: Hunter and Hickey families secure new visas with permission to stay in the U.K. until December 31, 1981, working for the ICA.

Contradiction: Premature eschatology causes "Chicken Little" syndrome. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXI'S

External: John Patterson arrives for one-half day report on India trek with Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay.

Internal: Guest night is held for neighborhood people and the Emerging Generation's teachers where showing the French version of the global film is a great event, evoking images of local Town Meeting possibilities.

Contradiction: Developing new forms of catalyzation if nexus is indeed the formation catalyzer. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: The permeation of women's groups in Brussels continues and of N.G.O.s with completion of a conference report and up-to-date correspondence.

Internal: Hosting guests from neighborhood (St. Gilles) in French Immersion evening. Ho use uses learning French as occasion to renew old contacts.

Contradiction: Finding the symbolic glue as House goes off in three different directions. (Wk.7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: House participates in Berlin Symposium then returns to host a core meeting of 10 on the Frankfurt Regional Consult which produces many leads for framing workshop.

Internal: Remaneuvering for the Regional Consult in the midst of swirling dust from House renovation.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensive generalship while being frontline troops. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Visit with President of the Board of Directors delivers two new translators, possible inkind printing of wall size social process triangles and a 50 gelder per month pledge. Volunteers continue to show up at the house weekly with offers to help. The House is invited to participate in neighborhood Wijk (district) action group.

Internal: Both global and local tensions are held with collegiums and PSUs on GRA preparation and Consult/circuit rationales and plans.

Contradiction: Competing in the local employment market for self-support with little knowledge of the local language, procedures or local news. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: The first Regional Consult in Europe after the pilot is completed with 50 people at the Symposium conducted in German. Nine additional continental staff are trained and the English document is printed.

Internal: The staff experiences profound appreciation for its colleagues as they share in this Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Discerning the concrete actions that move the region from a comprehensive four-year vision into viable initiation steps. (Wk.7)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: The House delivers brochures on two religious order consultations to be held in Quarter IV to 150 religious order generalates. The "All Roads Lead to Rome" maneuvers for an intensive framing push on government, church and legal are thought through and launched. An invitation to a Club of Rome luncheon results in many new English-speaking contacts in business.

Internal: Brussels Nexus arrives in the form of Operations and Development to enable the House to find a new facility and to broaden movement contacts.

Contradiction: Solving the here and now problem of housing for staging towards the longrange solution. (Wk.4)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Staff receives request for "set" training. Circuit to Oslo Region gains new contacts and possibility of permeation next year. Flyer is completed for initial development for Consult.

Internal: Staff sends Knutsen to Berlin Regional Consult; Lis returns from Oslo and Ingrid from Switzerland.

Contradiction: Discerning the pillars of training for local facilitators when our consensus and decision-making and workshoping methods are urgently being requested. (Wk.4)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Dr. Shawky's visit with Governor and Bayad site visit by governor's envoy culminate in active support of Regional Consult. Minya University staff finalize invitations and translate Symposium.

Internal: Bee Nabila Issack's new governorate teaching job opens new structured House relationship proposals.

Contradiction: Inviting necessary participants with Regional Consult three weeks away. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: The House finds itself amazed at over-all readiness even though several blocks still stand before the HDTs opens — decor and curriculum are prepared, many goods and much equipment are gathered, and facility construction is progressing well. The HDTs faculty training sessions include four KHDP residents.

Internal: Highlights include a wild impromptu "Saturday Night Special" of EG entertainment and group games, and the House welcomes Jos Willemsa from Amsterdam and sends Chipawa back to school after a month student holiday sojourn.

Contradiction: Anticipating blocks before they arise. (Wk.5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: New training team does first impact course with 80 for Imaginal Education course highlighted by art form conversation response to African statue of people stacked on top of each other: "That is what happens when you don't practice family planning." New district officer for Machakos Pilot District startles all with, "Oh, yes, Kawangware, I participated as a student in their first workday in the midst of the team's initial visit to explain its work."

Internal: Roundtable takes radical upturn as staff starts new study book on African Religions by an African Christian theologian with first study on time.

Contradiction: Locating whistle points and not letting life dribble away by doing a little of this and a little of that. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI

External: Preparation activity intensifies with the approach of the second cluster consult to be held in the second sub-location in Muputi. Leaders preparation meeting with eight representatives from each village indicates strong village interest and great anticipation of launching a great new cluster project.

Internal: Installation of inkinded window panes enables control of house "air-conditioning and dust control" system.

Contradiction: Enabling the actuation of the first cluster in the midst of the flurry of preparation activities for the second cluster consult. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay arrive. Twenty visits in Bombay alone releases eleven leading private sector people to say yes to being on the International Exposition 1982 Committee. The long-awaited jeep arrives.

Internal: A dinner reception for the Lindsays at the nexus calls for a week-long renovation event — painted kitchen, bathrooms and hall, new porch furniture and beautiful curtains — gives our “lovely home” (Lady Lindsay’s words) a great new look. Three sojourners from Britain are key renovators.

Contradiction: Releasing enough resources to equip ashrams with basic housing materials and essentials tools and formats. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Three Gram Sabhas and a training session are held for the Rayalaseema Development Trust, an organization doing over 200 villages in four-block programs in Anantapur Metro. The water pipes are in for the Nadlapur water system.

Internal: Auxiliary names English class as the event of the week, and a trip is made to see the “Hyderabad Exhibition” of Indian products.

Contradiction: Enabling leadership to move toward consensus on house repairs. (Wk. 6)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Circuit to Patna secures four Hindi CYFs for Week 8. Visits by Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay lead to Rs 12 lakhs working for MHDP Phase III, five requests to do HDPs, six LENS secured and church authorization with local Archbishop and Mother Theresa. First Guardians meeting of the year grounds the team in the local frame.

Internal: House hosts the Lindsays and colleagues Mary D’Souza, Stanley Gibson and John Patterson and participates in a week of overwhelming engagement celebrated by two days of discontinuity.

Contradiction: Using strategically the outcome of the Lindsays’ visit to move beyond Regional Consult and strengthen the movement base to focus on new directions. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Staff works closely with Kuala Lumpur Region in development blitz, Texas Instrument training, a GWF and LENS marketing.

Internal: Return of Centrum Band meeting representatives gives opportunity to hear report on all four and to reflect on their implications.

Contradiction: Priority of serving the regions hinders corporate focus on broad futuristic arenas. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Invitation from Bank Pertanian to consult with them on a demonstration village project creates great opening in the

Ipoh Metro. A fine location for the Regional Consult Symposium is nailed down at last. Ninety-four invitations mailed to Guardians and supporters for Sungai Lui Open Day — and Headman Dato Yusop guns the preparation!

Internal: Tasty Chinese delicacies are enjoyed at a metro colleague’s home during the Chinese New Year celebration. Arlene is sent out to complete medical school registration and interviews.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between comprehensive work at the target district level and covering the whole region with Regional Consult preparation. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Metro extension is launched with strong and active government involvement and Guardian initiation.

Internal: House receives Kazuhiro, an agricultural engineer from Japan, and his global presence and particular skills are great gifts in preparing and initiating Tanjung Pura Kecamatan Assembly and in continuing cluster actuation.

Contradiction: Training Guardians in LENS pedagogy with many LENS’s on the horizon to further their journeys. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: First working Advisory Board meeting sets the context and prepares the tactics for Indonesian registration. Local initiative is everywhere as two great workdays go on simultaneously in the village.

Internal: House hosts a Japanese visitor from Yubari, and a great poolside buffet following Advisory Board meeting is spicy ending to an historical event.

Contradiction: Catalyzing strategy that will allow a group to pick up Symposium sponsorship. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Thirty farmers from three cluster villages meet in Bontoa with extension workers to rehearse their double-crop rice victories and to plan for the second planting. Tambua preschool begins in new location with headman and others creating the space.

Internal: Celebration of Terry’s birthday and the long awaited arrival of Brian Townley and Russell White marks the week.

Contradiction: Breaking through the cluster with tasks that motivate and engage. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Operations works through interchange models, Regional Consult initiation and assignments for two areas. January is the biggest development month with US\$60,000 in hand. Reports received from areas feed into new financial plan for the next six months.

Internal: Linda Duffy is a welcome arrival from Bananeiras and she arrives as House celebrates the Lunar New Year with visits in the city, traditional Chinese food and open house where the global film generates much conversation with the 19 guests.

Contradiction: Fearing the radically new paralyzes the story of how the total missional thrust can be broken open by the Regional Consult event! (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Five new participating organizations in the public and voluntary sectors are secured for the Regional Consult, with three supplying panelists for the Symposium. World Bank consultant based in Hong Kong makes site visit with wife and children, bringing new perspectives on Nam Wai’s future and his participation in it.

Internal: Nam Wai Village literally explodes with Chinese New Year — with firecrackers popping day and night and

unicorns dancing at our door; House marks the holiday with a picnic in the country park.

Contradiction: Ensuring participation of local sector village leadership in Regional Consult. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Kaohsiung Development breaks open new personal contributions from directors and managers of Chinese companies. Preparation for March-April HDOS (Human Development Orientation Session) begins to take shape with staff recruitment and facility renovation.

Internal: *Yertle The Turtle* addresses the House with simultaneous simplicity and profundity of myth factor and the importance of it in daily life.

Contradiction: Finding the events and forms for engagement with the expansion villages that begin to move vast slow-moving arenas. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Week 5 yields development income of US\$2,300, bringing January total to US\$11,000 in hand. Two hundred fifty invitations are sent to ICA supporters and friends in Taiwan for appreciation luncheon on February 19 which is being sponsored by the President Hotel in Taipei. Ten interviews with staff applicants result in two definite possibilities.

Internal: Linda Yang returns from the Philippines after a two-week sojourn to Manila, Sudtonggan and the human development projects on Mactan Island.

Contradiction: Keeping pressure on the staff enlistment process and the February development thrust without ignoring the preplanning and positioning required now for task expansion and self-support victories in September. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Audit preparation is completed in record time of one week. Visits from professors of two colleges of the University of Philippines arrange speaking engagements and explore possibilities of field work in projects.

Internal: House hosts from Koh Du E Ri, Korea, the village treasurer, chief and county officer; from Taipei, Linda Yang; from Cebu, Vicki Aguirang; and from Chicago, Charles Hahn.

Contradiction: Designing local financial systems that flow with the growth of the cash flow. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Deputy Minister of Health from Manila visits Sudtonggan Health Center and judges it to be the best example of a primary health care center he has seen in the Philippines. He asks Sudtonggan to host 36 Deputy Health Ministers and their guests from ten S.E.A. nations.

Internal: Training School and staff residence is rewired and electrified as Sudtonggan is connected to the national electricity grid.

Contradiction: Discerning way to reveal the 24 Early Learning Nutrition Centers on Mactan to the Ministers of Health and their S.E.A. guests. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: La Paz HDP holds community meeting to improve the General Store. Davao City Health Office approves free clinic days for all villages. Langub HDP has week of celebrations, including preschool teacher wedding and Mojon Fiesta.

Internal: New sojourner is welcomed from Carmem HDP; House renovation continues with painting and new cooking area creation.

Contradiction: Holding activities and preschool with heavy rains. (Wk. 4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Tokyo House finds that the entire staff are P.R. people as all re-articulate ICA story while recruiting for the many programs scheduled for this quarter. The Global Language School is ready to go!

Internal: Tokyo House welcomes the Fukuda family into the House (the first sojourning family in Japan); Mr. Fukuda arrives and squeezes himself and all his belongings into one of the rooms.

Contradiction: Locating the strategic pressure points which will release the explosion of the programs of care. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI

External: Thirty leaders from the seven villages gather in monthly planning, affirming the decision and excitement of the six expansion projects which will share the 5 million won (US\$8,065) in helping to launch cattle-fattening projects in response to the initiating gift from the Seoul International Women's Association. Each village will contribute one million won or more and build or locate cattle barn accommodation. Interest in HDTS is high and Koh Sung E Ri is the first to get in registration money.

Internal: Two trips to Seoul allow participation in the congregation dinner and the wedding of the Lee Kang Jin family, and a collegium on spirit conversations points whole House toward HDTS methods.

Contradiction: Catalyzing the actions to perform on cue in final two weeks before HDTS. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Women's task force on Tuesday does LENS records and Advisors' meeting on Tuesday night does a training module on speech writing with Christina Clark. Thirty companies are visited for LENS — five companies are already committed for LENS in June. AFIA man attends roundtable and plans to attend GLS and LENS. New Japan Steel Company schedules Town Meeting for March 7 and Mr. Isurota (Advisor) works on the workbook.

Internal: New house is secured. Three Obunsha jobs are secured this week in Kumomoto, Yahata and Fukuoka. Training modules continue to work well — 15 Japanese colleagues have participated in them.

Contradiction: Moving carefully step by step to secure new training center. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: First of two LENS is held with Impex Chemical's Industrial Chemicals Division. LENS leadership journeys Guardians Kobori and Tanaka. Friday Night at the Institute continues to introduce new colleagues to the Third Wave.

Internal: Becky Boon travels to Fukuoka to participate in a one-day Global Language School, and House Church is enlivened by the presence of Mark and Ruth Reames.

Contradiction: Building relationships colleague to colleague so that individual order members are not the key link. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: LENS registrations come in — two from Hoppoken (largest corporation in Hokkaido), two from Empire Cleaning Company and five committed from Hokkaido Prefectural Government. US\$250 per person is no problem.

Internal: Roundtable begins with Third Wave study on computers. "But how can a computer teach the fine arts of Samurai sword-making?" someone asks.

Contradiction: Forgetting details — minor interruptions foul up good plans. (Wk. 6)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE : SYDNEY

External: Summer '81 in Adelaide is highlighted by endless singing at closing steak dinner, a new community LENS document and manual, and the commissioning of the first regional priorship troika. There are two good community LENS possibilities — one urban and one rural.

Internal: Face lifting over December-January results in a "like-new" kitchen, the world's jazziest shower curtains and bathroom renovation in process. Staff will welcome the Telakau family to Sydney Region after their visit to Murrin Bridge.

Contradiction: Creating the phased, specific operational design for the next eight weeks that covers all the bases and includes all the troops. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE

External: Another forward step in consensus-making occurs as a new industry committee is formed after 18-month wait for \$12,000 government grant. Many stake visits happen with Indian and Polynesian visitors. Football team wins the Grand Final, second year in a row.

Internal: P.T. James and the Telakau family visit the project after the summer program and Sydney Area Council in Adelaide.

Contradiction: Demonstrating the life-giving power of accountable structures. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: First week of Regional Consult setup is whirlwind of activity including development, framing and re-engagement of old colleagues. Everyone agrees that the time is *right* for four-sector planning with a human factor emphasis. Internal: House welcomes youth, Amanda Telford, from Murrin Bridge, sends out David and Sue White family to new job in Alice Springs, and launches new regional team experiment with first corporate planning session.

Contradiction: Finding it hard to see the trees for the forest. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: First trip to Tasmania in '80-81 does CYF and faculty consultation with Salesian secondary school in Hobart. Workshop with municipal councillor targets frame and committee needed.

Internal: Olga Jones from New Zealand stops on way home from summer program and joins House in initiating LENS setup.

Contradiction: Creating the coordinated plan and story that ground exciting images from the summer in the local turf. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Extended house meeting over Week II covers Area Sydney Summer '81 report, LENS pedagogy and preparation for businessmen's luncheon.

Internal: Colleagues return from Adelaide in time for fast, feast and furniture shifting.

Contradiction: Developing a clear vision of the strategic objectives of formation and training. (Wk.6)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: In preparation for Regional Consult, master index cards are created for Apia Region with contact records since 1970. Human Development Symposium preparation is initiated by colleagues' design of five-evening format, inking Aggie Grey's facility and the Minister of Education will be guest speaker. Regional Consult brochure is drafted with exciting five-evening format. Metro gears up for Samoan style Regional Consult.

Internal: House sends Interchange letter and finishes *UPDATE* mailing; and a fine roundtable turns the mundane into spirit.

Contradiction: Moving with confidence into the future without visas. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AUCKLAND

External: The Havelock North Pilot Employment Scheme is launched by the community's decision to form an economic development trust. The senior citizens of Havelock North come to the House to hear the ICA story. Excitement is everywhere.

Internal: This week equips the house with a new stove, dishes and cooking equipment, and the file cabinet is completed by a painting party to give the ICA-(New Zealand) office a face lift.

Contradiction: Building a comprehensive list of participants for the Regional Consult that *in fact* represents the four sectors. (Wk.7)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Accelerated activity by regional colleagues is indicated by Regional Recruitment Team, Regional Practices Team meeting and waiting lines for phone access.

Internal: Youth Trek occasions new look at the future by Phase I and results in another look at the past by Phases II, III and IV.

Contradiction: Finding the structure that will maintain chastity in the week's task, effectively use troops and enable information access while maintaining the momentum. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Symposium visits with upfront context of hope call forth many new colleagues. Roundtable format with depth news conversation sparks powerful symposium conversation. Major development proposals are written; \$9,000 is committed and 35 corporations are researched.

Internal: Elvie Languido is assigned to region in time for powerful Week II and celebrations; key collegium broke loose new depth in Symposium interview style and questions.

Contradiction: Clarifying the vision on what the Los Angeles Region is calling the ICA, EI and O:E to do. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHGROVE

External: The Richgrove Training School is launched with art form method session on Saturday. The following Monday, the

first of six Monday evenings, 23 participate in charting the community's current sewer study proposal. Funding request for community stadium goes before County Board of Supervisors with encouraging nods.

Internal: House Church guests double the number around the table.

Contradiction: Giving adequate form to multiple community thrusts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Regional Consult preparation gains momentum as four teams of Phoenix Guardians meet to plan their trips for taking the "Breakfast Conversation" on the road across Arizona. Ruth Jefferies hosts exciting breakfast meeting on Wednesday. Circuits to New Mexico launches similar events in New Mexico and El Paso.

Internal: Staff sends Alex St. Clair to Youth Presidium on behalf of youth cluster and sends Kate and Bob on ten-day New Mexico—Texas circuit.

Contradiction: Ensuring the development bottomline in the midst of expanding contacts and Guardian missional engagement. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PISINEMO

External: Girls Club begins meeting three times per week. Farm Guild fertilizes and tills seven family gardens. Elderly group from another district takes a tour of Pisinemo projects.

Internal: Local VISTA volunteers plan objectives for next year and all decide to re-enroll.

Contradiction: Turning the new edge of community hopes and dreams into implementable programs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Six week marketing strategy gets under way with 2,000 industry brochures sent out to area ranchers and dealers. Development Corporation Board meeting settles leasing of cafe, hiring of new store manager trainee and the reduction of post office hours. Cafe is officially opened under new management — Betty and Herman Elk.

Internal: A full-fledged guest drops in from California to visit Carole for the long weekend.

Contradiction: Focusing resources corporately to allow effective action. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: The regional team celebrates the completion of a week of victory in Regional Consult preparation that includes printing 2,000 fine brochures, mailing 200 formal invitations to the Symposium, sending development letters to 40 targeted corporations and circuiting to Grand Junction, where the team stayed with the mayor.

Internal: The staff's sense of space, internal and external, is expanded as it holds two global collegiums — the Global Band Meetings reports and GRA '81 prep, celebrates three birthdays and decides on weekly forays to Boulder to hear a series of lectures on evolution and religion, the centennial celebration of Teilhard de Chardin.

Contradiction: Trying to convince ourselves that the contradiction is NOT the lack of time and troops! (Wk. 6)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Week of framing activity lays groundwork for LENS, Advisory Board addition and RVI, plus requests for consultations with three churches.

Internal: Task force planning event signals contextual re-education, spirit remotivation and structural reformulation.

Contradiction: Seeing through to the keystone. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Metro circuit into Fairbanks Metro reaches new people and new possibilities for a future GWF. A core is readying itself for this task. The House along with metro colleagues in Anchorage completes a phasing model for Regional Consult.

Internal: The House sends the Henrys to Dallas and at the same time welcomes Ted Ariel from Chicago, and the circuit team returns to the city.

External: The Winnipeg team launches the LENS preparation with luncheon host committee invitations and the first two commitments. The host committee now includes Mr. Whithead, Editor of Brandon Sun, and Jack Nesbitt of the University of Manitoba. Interim filing system and circuit rationale is set up.

Internal: House begins the week welcoming Richard Kitney, encounters the mystery with car breakdown and, finally, celebrates Valentine's Day with EG party and adult night out on the town.

Contradiction: Deciding to find corporate time together to work through issues. (Wk. 7)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Special Issues Forum on "Inhalant Abuse" is held with 30 residents from the East End of Houston — slogan chosen: "Don't Stain Your Brain". Follow-up is scheduled to form task forces and decide on implementation. Seventy residents of Manvel, Texas, hold Community Forum. A new freeway is about to be finished, linking them to Houston; and they anticipate population increase from 3,000 to 30,000 in four years.

Internal: Major events of this key week include cluster participation in the Special Issues Forum and the Manvel Town Meeting, and the first roundtable of the quarter which is a great event with study of Toffler's *Third Wave* and solitary sodality. Claire Clements flies to New Jersey to participate in national finals of dance scholarship competition.

Contradiction: Creating exemplary House style with new decor and space revitalization when we are planning to move as soon as possible. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ASHERTON

External: Presentation of CEM documents and announcement of transition plans release community motivity. Visits for Regional Consult sponsorship reveal strong frame and deep interest. Linwood United Methodist Church of Oklahoma City holds planning retreat using Town Meeting methods. From citizen comments there is joy and pride in receiving the CEM document. Pierson is opening a garage and welding shop while Chebahaah's renovate grocery to open around March 1.

Internal: EG enjoy a Valentine party which includes homemade sundaes and lots of other treats on Valentine's Day.

Contradiction: Nurturing collegial decision of the regional team to be a regional team and to bring the Regional Consult into reality. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Holiday Inn Executive Conference Center is secured for Regional Consult at cost plus 10%. Date is shifted to March 18-19 (weekdays) for Symposium, releasing all to see new possibilities for recruitment of public sector. Advisors list of 12 is completed and confirmed for brochure mailing.

Internal: "Seeking for" turns to "being sought" as Mary Z. Longstreth's boss offers possibility of videotape ministry and David Zahrt is invited to assist a Congregational church in defining its ministry.

Contradiction: Putting in the hands of colleagues the necessary tools to recruit the Regional Consult. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Regional Consult, "DIALOGUE '81", is announced with the initial mailing going out. Color brochure/poster ready for print names Moon Landrieu as the keynote speaker. The regional women are gearing up for a night in New Orleans.

Internal: Phase I House enablement team takes the baton and steps in front with EG gourmet cooking, high scoring report cards and a winning soccer season.

Contradiction: Appropriating a grand adventurous journey while discovering options for living the fulfilled and engaged life. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Fear and fascination of the Regional Consult sets in as regional colleagues practice interviewing each other and lay out detailed timeline, covering all fronts, for the Consult.

Internal: The House is full again for "Ur Celebration" where all six urs are represented with food, dress, decor, traditions and songs.

Contradiction: Keeping the "see-saw" moving up and down. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Site visit to Pace HDP last year by Rev. McGee nets a demonstration Town Meeting with local neighborhood group. He is planning to attend the GRA this summer because of what he saw in Pace.

Contradiction: Turning warm bodies into cold cash for the Symposium. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Youth rent van and trek to Chicago for Continental Youth Presidium. Larry Loeppke and Donna Ziegenhorn facilitate abbreviated LENS format for Home Box Office District #1 planning. Home Box Office employees now think they really have something else.

Internal: All is quiet on home front as Youth Presidium reduces number at roundtable from 13 to 5; and Rhoda Ertle sojourns for two days on brief return to Kansas City.

Contradiction: Answering longrange vision questions which become more and more an existential issue as quarter's tactics are being regularly ticked off. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: The first corporation LENS in the region, held at Inter-North in Omaha, is well received. State of Iowa Department of Health accepts LENS proposal. Lincoln Metro focuses on methods training and signals beginning of metro team responsibility.

Internal: November and December finance forms are completed and submitted.

Contradiction: Clarifying the rest of the quarter's tactics and the specific six-month objectives. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The second all-day session on Structural Permeation yields the first draft of a permeation mandate and the beginning of a timeline for in-depth research. Contradiction: Catalyzing colleagues' participation in guild work following metro council. (Wk. 7)

External: Forty appointments are held in relation to the Regional Consult using rural networks. Week is highlighted by a pre-Regional Consult workshop on the issues in the arena of education.

Internal: In the midst of 40 appointments and troops spread across the region, the staff is sustained by the roundtable and a report on Latin America.

Contradiction: Turning those who are excited about the Regional Consult into paid registrations. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Hostage return impacts roundtable at Armours'. Alan Crain spreads his enthusiasm for Maliwada and shares the impact of the Maliwada House prior on his life with the circuit team. Inkind victories of offset plates for CEM document and Gestafax stencils for Regional Consult are received. Annual Appeal report and thank-yous are sent to regional donors.

Internal: House appreciates helpful images provided by Training Post Collegium I on formation.

Contradiction: Ensuring maximum regional team participation in Regional Consult planning PSU as eight-week countdown has all forces on board. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN**

External: Community holds fine workday to create gameroom in the back of the Grill Building. Regional Consult Planning PSU draws five colleagues from three metros and all House personnel (who live in three different metros) to launch a fine Regional Consult event. Beckley circuit nets first two Regional Consult registrations.

Internal: New maps arrive for new regional decor and management trek yields workable three faceted system.

Contradiction: Releasing bold imaginations now so that bold programs occur in spring. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional Consult takes more commanding charge of the minds and hearts of the regional team and colleagues as The Industrial Labor Relations Center of Cornell University confirms the date of May 8-17 for use of their facilities. Nearby lodging is confirmed, and mailing to 100 key colleagues announcing these facts goes out. Key framing and development appointments continue to open new challenges and possibilities.

Internal: Bob Mayo, senior statesman of the Rochester Guardians, drives youth to Chicago for Youth Presidium and meets with nexus staff regarding the future of the Charlotte Valley Firewood Company.

Contradiction: Completing a set of blueprints, when steps already taken have laid a foundation. (Wk. 8)

Local church plans a fund-raising event with youth using simulation of village life and fasting, with funds going to a village project. John attends second meeting of Maine Government Guild with representatives from three state departments.

Internal: Corporate session to get income-tax returns in the mail and get refunds back and refurbishing the downstairs lounge are good February tactics.

conference planning group at University of Maine, Farmington, almost triples and commits itself to involving more grassroots Mainers in future planning. Joni Fleishman saves the day with explanation of youth forum construct in key sponsorship call, and the global film is shown at three film nights.

Internal: Colleague Bonnie Russel's car breaks down on Tobin Bridge following Boston Education PSU, providing two hours of unanticipated collegial discussion. House celebrates Valentine's Day by seeing *Private Benjamin*.

Contradiction: Building an effective self-support maneuver while not dropping any of the program thrust. (Wk. 7)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Canadian Pulp and Paper Association, Woodlands Division, approves Women's Workshop for 75 managers' wives attending the National Annual Convention. Monique Dion, a Sudbury 2001 colleague, decides to represent French Canada at the Paris Regional Consult.

Internal: Monique Le Guillou has corrective surgery on her shoulder at the Royal Victoria Hospital in Montreal.

Contradiction: Struggling to anticipate consensus when the strategic impact of the longrange journey with networks is still very unclear. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Toronto core celebrates Training Inc. visit to George Brown College and returns to quarter planning for the Symposium. Symposium date and place are confirmed.

Contradiction: Forging consensus at key critical moments when troops are scattered across the geography. (Wk. 5)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: House and Woburn Lawn Village become "team" during intensive week of workdays and nights on preschool. USAID team of five visits Project and expresses great excitement over roles being picked up by the local people. Youth Forum is held in Trinityville as climax to a weeklong program on youth.

Internal: Three collegiums are done on the region and the regional program design; and Donrad Duncan spends first week as intern in the House.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of midquarter victories while finalizing completion plan for the year. (Wk. 6)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Preparation for sewing industry is initiated when Azpitia resident teaches two others pants tailoring. Lima cadre completes weeklong methods course with a mini-celebration and evaluation.

Internal: Eliseo and Geronima Rivas arrive to create an auxiliary representing six nations. Azpitia and auxiliary send Lucy Aponte to assignment in Madrid in drama-filled sendout celebration.

Contradiction: Creating the strategy to build effectively the regional teams. (Wk. 5)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: The Barlovento Human Development Team meets with full representation from three villages for the first time in Juan Diaz after week of visiting villages for commitment from eight villages for representation at the Human Development Conference (Regional Consult). Setup for the Consult gains momentum with housing in six metros, brochures out to all four sectors. Annual Appeal begins in Area Caracas.

Internal: Global Development Team arrives; Toyota mechanic and cat veterinary services are inked.

Contradiction: Focusing Regional Consult recruitment with strategic coverage of the four sectors. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Conserving industry is launched with test batch of delicious cantaloupe marmalade. New enlarged Consejo (Community Board) welcomes five new members with new marmalade samples. Youth Club does new simplified form of Youth Forum (V model) with enthusiasm. Laying-hen project is resurrected as hens start laying again, and Community Kitchen receives donation of potatoes from community family.

Internal: New Tagore ritual is translated in time for House Church, and House holds two collegiums on Master Strategies of Declaration, Manifestation and Formation.

Contradiction: Creating the images, the time and space designs that enable all to move beyond operating out of day-to-day immediacies. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Community Forums are held in three villages in the nearby municipality of Araruama. Corporation president visits Bananeiras and offers to sponsor Community Forums in Recife.

Internal: Auxiliary visit to the town of Rio Bonito combines House search with getting to know its new territory.

Contradiction: Choosing the strategic moves among many opportunities. (Wk. 7)

Area Singapore reports \$35,000 income during Weeks 2 and 3 with a \$5,000 LENS in North Sumatra. Regional House and Nexus team join forces in Kuala Lumpur. The multinational contact list prepared for the Global Development Centrum Band Meeting is being used for effective cross-nation webbing of companies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the tension between being on the road all the time and creating effective advance circuit strategies.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports from Singapore that the Sydney Summer Programme is launched with more than 50 present. Brussels reports that the *Catalysis* talking paper, the quarter's assignments, the "fortnight" design, Regional Consult reflections and interchange packets all get another spin in the one week when all hands are together before the next six weeks in dispersion. Hong Kong reports sending on their *New Essentialism* talking paper whilst receiving Bombay's, signalling effective interchange. In Chicago the Youth Presidium is a great event where the Trends-Concerns-Options-Elements-Declaration method with detailed written procedures was key. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating the story that allows us to anticipate and dance through the increasing work load.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the Berlin, San Francisco and Caracas Regional Consults are completed. Documents are being printed and teams are in place. A core of Chinese colleagues decide to meet weekly at Hong Kong Nexus for 12 weeks to enable Regional Consult setup. 5th City and Cannon Ball local residents participate in national government "Free Enterprise Zone" Conference. First university LENS in Singapore zone is held. The key contradiction lies in the arena of imaging the Regional Consult as that which focuses rather than replaces or overrides regional program.

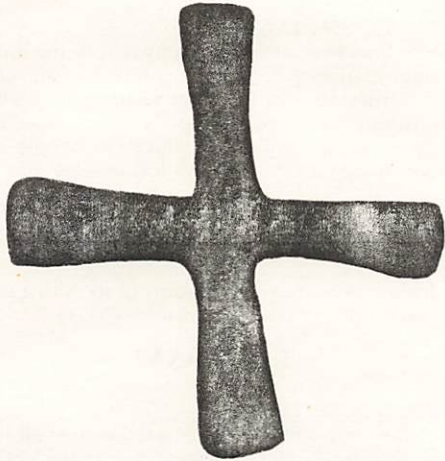
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Prioritizing troops and area strength to bring off self-support and Regional Consults. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Symposium story enables strong development push, entry into Glasgow frame, heals old wounds and secures family hosts for practicum week in all six metros.

Internal: Neighbors, two adjoining houses, participate in fine roundtable event for the first time, and space reclamation anticipates influx of troops for the Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Balancing the global/local and futuric/immediate tensions in order to give form to the Spirit Movement. (Wk. 8)

Internal: House sends out Michael Shaw to new assignment in Glasgow and Sheila Hickey to Paris Consult; Bill accepts job offer with Alcan in Newport, completing the establishment of self-support base for house move to Cardiff.

Contradiction: Grasping hold of the comprehensive when being caught up in immediacy particulars. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Fabulous Formation Fortnight facility is found! CARITAS Belgium invites ICA to use its fine centrally located, spacious building in Brussels for the Formation Fortnight in April.

Internal: As house troops shrink to four people, another guest night is held and everything else keeps going.

Contradiction: Overseeing Fortnight preparation continentally with minimum of troops. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: The permeation of women's groups in Brussels continues and of N.G.O.s with completion of a conference report and up-to-date correspondence.

Internal: Hosting guests from neighborhood (St. Gilles) in French Immersion evening, House uses learning French as occasion to renew old contacts.

Contradiction: Finding the symbolic glue as House goes off in three different directions. (Wk. 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: House participates in Berlin Symposium then returns to host a core meeting of 10 on the Frankfurt Regional Consult which produces many leads for framing workshop.

Internal: Remaneuvering for the Regional Consult in the midst of swirling dust from house renovation.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensive generalship while being frontline troops. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week's circuit covers the territory from north to south and east to west as the regional team begins putting concretions on events and activities in Amsterdam Region and scheduled continental events. First family sends in full registration for the continental fortnight training event. The first subscription to the *IMAGE* arrives.

Internal: *The Third Wave* arrives in hard cover from a New York colleague and provides images for a family Week II and new images for Dutch colleagues as they meet Mr. Alvin Toffler.

External: Regional team completes another full week of appointments to recruit seminars for international religious orders, and preparation was done on the seminar construct for the Divine Word Fathers. Guardian enables house search. Preparations are made for Sam Hanson's arrival on legal trek.

Internal: Fine roundtable is led by youth on study of the *Common Worship* paper.

Contradiction: Enabling the Regional Consult to be an authentic part of the undergirding Rome maneuver. (Wk. 7)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: World Health Organization is revisited for next step on setting up Primary Health Care conference for Europe. Thisted Town Meeting is tied down and translators (English and American) are secured. Workshop material is delivered for DANIDA committee (Danish Aid Branch of Foreign Affairs) at their request.

Internal: Andrew Knutsen is sent from Berlin Regional Consult to Paris; and Banks arrives from Berlin to do Town Meetings in outlying metros of Copenhagen Region.

Contradiction: Firmly establishing metro cores. (Wk. 7)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Dr. Shawky's visit with Governor and Bayad site visit by governor's envoy culminate in active support of Regional Consult. Minya University staff finalize invitations and translate Symposium.

Internal: Bee Nabila Issack's new governorate teaching job opens new structured House relationship proposals.

Contradiction: Inviting necessary participants with Regional Consult three weeks away. (Wk. 5)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: School evaluation by faculty reveals the image shift from demonstration to training is complete. Four grads and auxiliary journey to Ado-Ekiti and set up ten special issues (health) forums with permeation contact. Site visits by University of Lagos continuing education people result in forums and troops for next week's forum set.

Internal: Marj Philbrook returns to North America while Jaime and Mary Lou Vergara, accompanied by Owolala Olutunje, are sent out to Zambia for Kapini HDTS.

Contradiction: Mobilizing two teams of six with a myriad of detailed tasks and no vehicle available. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: The House finds itself amazed at over-all readiness even though several blocks still stand before the HDTS opens — decor and curriculum are prepared, many goods and much equipment are gathered, and facility construction is progressing well. The HDTS faculty training sessions include four KHDP residents.

Internal: Highlights include a wild impromptu "Saturday Night Special" of EG entertainment and group games, and the House welcomes Jos Willemsa from Amsterdam and sends Chipawa back to school after a month student holiday sojourn.

Contradiction: Anticipating blocks before they arise. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Kaani Sub-Location Consult (the second sub-location consult) is held with exuberant participation from six villages. Firestone continues support with 1981 check for 45,000/-, one-half of this year's commitment.

Internal: House studies Sassa and Zamani, the African concept of Past, Present and Future, and welcomes Christopher Foya back from teaching in the Ijede HDTS.

Contradiction: Consensing on the focus of next year's programmatic thrust. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA

External: Auxiliary holds village meetings in each of the six villages of the new cluster project, which will open with the Consult the second of February. High village preparation indicates the eagerness and readiness of the villages to create their own future with the cluster project.

Internal: Construction Guild completes cementing the community water tank roof, a major step toward implementing the 25,000 gallon water tank.

Contradiction: Maintaining reasonable internal life in the midst of highly demanding cluster consult. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: International Exposition framing campaign yields 18 yeses and 11 pending for the sponsor committee from the cream of Indian sectors. One thousand village women are impacted by GWF trek through Maliwada and Jawale clusters.

A four-sector meeting of 50 people at Oberoi Hotel begins to knit together the Bombay Human Development cadre in participation for the Regional Consult, while 10,000 rupees are collected in Nagpur for the Regional Consult. All this signals four-sector readiness for regional and cluster consults.

Contradiction: Creating the forms and models to catch the fall-out from myriads of breakthroughs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Sevagram completes new community center and does first bakery run with "Seva-bread". Twenty-five Maliwada leaders are sent out to build the circle and four preschools, and Chikhale has strong tangible support from district and county chairmen for circle and block. Jawale's 280-woman GWF Assembly concludes electrifying ten village impact events with 1200 women. Male's Community Development Association on the move constructs new community center.

Internal: A new five-year lease is obtained on Maliwada Ashram (castle), staff of six out of nine ashrams are in new blue dress, and a new three-region song is printed.

Contradiction: Designing hardheaded four-sector leadership commitment and formulation strategies. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Sikror Open Day is an unforgettable event for the village as the Collector opens new community centre, switches on Sikror's first electric lights and inaugurates 1500-foot entrance road. Among honored guests are past Prime Minister of Norway and the Australian High Commissioner. Twenty-five villagers from emerging circle cluster attend, and Shaharpur delegation demands Gram Sabha the following weekend.

Internal: Sojourner Rajeer Narulla arrives in time to help wash down the community centre floor and says he would be delighted to stay for area council.

Contradiction: Enabling the focused disciplined effort of the Open Day preparations to become the everyday life-style. (Wk. 6)

Internal: Auxiliary names English class as the event of the week, and a trip is made to see the "Hyderabad Exhibition" of Indian products.

Contradiction: Enabling leadership to move toward consensus on house repairs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

use in schools and with community (bustee) development workers. Imaginal Education and self-support contract for year is secured. Rajarampur village site visit with local chamber of commerce initiates dual strategy thrust (along with LENS) of institutional permeation.

Internal: House collegium on *Calcutta* widens images of city and state in terms of its historical role and present situation; and arrival of Anil Prasad and Gyan Prakash from Operations sets House in preparation for first Hindi CYFs in the area.

Contradiction: Seeing through the innumerable openings produced by calls to discern the truly catalytic tactics of the master strategies. (Wk. 7)

Internal: Gail West is welcomed for a week of Regional Consult preparation.

Contradiction: Objectifying sponsorship of the Regional Consult such that the ICA can plan the role of catalyst with other sponsors "up front". (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

Cluster village circuit results in one village piloting new maneuver meeting format for village council that they will lead weekly. Bubun leadership enthusiastically receives completed Village Master Plan from Mr. Dethe and plans the follow-up steps. Guardian visits after framing PSU and village environmental plan are pointing to kecamatan as pivotal development unit, and a guardian family asks to be assigned to LENS faculty as a family.

Contradiction: Clarifying midcourse strategy and future development activities as kecamatan unit and village councils (LKMD) take on focal importance. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: First Regional Consult Steering Committee is held and begins the process of nurturing new colleagues. New Mobil president, who has known of our work since Ecumenical Institute days, arrives. LENS calls reveal new eagerness despite new US\$6,000 fee.

Internal: West arrives en route to LENS marketing in Australia after two-month permeation probe in the middle of the

jungle; three-hour traffic jam between Jakarta and the village spurs momentum to relocate.

Contradiction: Journeying supporters and interested persons to a deeper and longrange understanding of the whole Regional Consult. (Wk.7)

Contradiction: Rethinking strategy to focus on a simplified thrust for the completion of the quarter while building broad-based frame for the Regional Consult. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Hong Kong regional task force meets for the first of its 12 sessions with key event of translating Hong Kong Regional Consult brochure into Chinese in two hours with a team of three.

Internal: Collegiums on training allow reflections on the profound function of training, and evening conversation on challenges facing Hong Kong gives a preview into the Regional Consult Symposium.

Contradiction: Creating releasing images for colleagues to see the Regional Consult as a foundational strategy calling the movement on stage. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Four weeks of English curriculum are created for Hai Ou youth and preschool classes. Information sheet on the upcoming Human Development Orientation session is ready for recruitment use. Chinese staff takes initiative in breaking open individual donations in the R.O.C. Local Hai Ou people take responsibility for hosting visitors from Oyubari and enjoy opportunity to use their Japanese language skills learned during Japanese occupation of Taiwan.

Internal: Highlight of week is special dinner and singing in a local family's home.

Contradiction: Putting into practice what you decide in theory (an old Chinese saying). (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development intensifies with over 50 visits during

the past two weeks. US\$5800 is deposited this month (including US\$1000 from individuals). Control Data agrees to request for inter-active terminal with access to the largest computer in Taiwan.

Internal: Peter Hu beams with announcement of his second grand-daughter (yet to be named), and House accommodations continually shift with in/out visitors from the Philippines, Hong Kong and Japan.

Contradiction: Discerning key next step in the midst of innumerable possibilities. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Two guardians travel to Osaka to serve as second and third leaders for the Impex Company LENS. Second conference is held to discuss a 1000-person Town Meeting in Tokyo.

Internal: Guarantee deposit is placed on a new 30-room house and all systems are mobilized to move before the end of February.

Contradiction: Ensuring a firm foundation of finance and program under the move to a house that is 1/3 larger than the present facility. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI

External: Thirty leaders from the seven villages gather in monthly planning, affirming the decision and excitement of the six expansion projects which will share the 5 million won (US\$8,065) in helping to launch cattle-fattening projects in response to the initiating gift from the Seoul International Women's Association. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Meeting with six municipal social education directors from Nara Prefecture begins set up of Town Meetings for the next fiscal year (Quarter IV). Meeting at the Nara Prefecture Office expands ICA contacts there to three new agencies and builds interest in community LENS. Speech

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Cross-centrum efforts produce and distribute first issue of the biweekly *News From The 4 Corners*, sharing reports on Regional Consult preparations and implications.

Internal: Global Guardians Alan Young (Vice President, Brunswick Mining and Smelting Corporation, Ltd. and Halifax Regional Consult sponsor), Pearl and Joe Watereus (Area Paris) and Peggy Herbert (Area London) impact the International Training Center with their visits and active missional concern.

Contradiction: Getting the whole picture in objective form in order to move strategically toward July '81. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: A full month before the Regional Consult Symposium, 847 interviews in all 36 poli of the region are completed with 26 paid registrations in hand — without including anyone from the House, Nexus or 5th City.

Internal: On Saturday night a community birthday party is held for the celebration of numerous February birthdays in the House and 5th City as trekers return from all the metros.

Contradiction: Looking very carefully, while moving into final stages of 1,000 interviews, for critical holes relating to Symposium recruitment and follow-up. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Youth rent van and trek to Chicago for Continental Youth Presidium. Larry Loeppke and Donna Ziegenhorn facilitate abbreviated LENS format for Home Box Office District #1 planning. Home Box Office employees now think they really have something else.

Internal: All is quiet on home front as Youth Presidium reduces number at Roundtable from 13 to 5; and Rhoda Ertle sojourns for two days on brief return to Kansas City.

Contradiction: Answering longrange vision questions which become more and more an existential issue as quarter's tactics are being regularly ticked off. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: New people from the community are involved in printing the *New Lorimorian*. RS-1 with 19 people holds push on socio-spirit understanding and three new LENS begin to establish program activity in Nebraska. Lorimor Community Boosters meeting plans full year activities.

Internal: Roundtable visits new restaurant in Lorimor after fine conversation that pushed struggle with creating humanness.

Contradiction: Following through on practical detail that will enable bottom lines to be met after making initial contacts. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The second all-day session on Structural Permeation yields the first draft of a permeation mandate and the beginning of a timeline for in-depth research. An all-out effort to market programs to service organizations and voluntary sector concerns has yielded a surprising openness in educational structures and one demonstration PSU is already scheduled with St. Paul's Central High School. MnDOT requests and receives a proposal for eight PSUs and a LENS with a pilot district, to involve maintenance crews and supervisors in problem-solving and to train them in PSU methods.

Internal: Regional team is enticed into going to the opera where *Tosca* is brilliantly supported by a choir in which Dr. Lewis Pierce is a first row participant.

Contradiction: Stimulating the interchange across permeation labs which is crucial to a priority which is late in coming to the forefront. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: EI/ICA course brochure is printed and mailed for upcoming RS-I and CS-III.A. Matthew Hockley and Kevin Woodward are sent to the Continental Youth Presidium. Regional team creates initial design and begins writing the Regional Consult brochure.

Internal: Regional colleagues and Carroll Smith from Development Centrum join the House in a workday preparing for an Evening at the Institute; and interviews signal acceleration of job search.

Contradiction: Organizing energy and troops to recruit and set up the RS-I while continuing to build momentum toward the Regional Consult. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Development calls and the PLC uncover regional spirit colleagues in the business and volunteer sectors and also open new directions for Regional Consult recruitment and proposal writing.

Internal: Friday evening "Development Wrap Up" celebrates affirmation of week's work, new Regional Consult proposal outline and homemade pizza.

Contradiction: Getting a rhythm of colleague engagement that enables them to participate significantly in the missional tasks. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Town Meetings and planning conferences are set up in Collinwood and Central as directory and survey projects are nearing completion in three neighborhoods. Education Guild kicks off plan for Imaginal Education as public school teacher training series.

Internal: Roundtable provides indepth motivating context for the Education Guild.

Contradiction: Making the hard choices among several equally important priorities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Black Town Meeting in Lafayette concludes with every person present being assigned by his or her peers to help implement one of the nine proposals. Metro colleague engagement in guilds, roundtable, House Church, workdays, phoning, circuiting and planning accelerates as 27 different colleagues are counted as working in the House this week for missional implementation.

Internal: Metro Workday at the House spiritizes everyone as *Update* is published, mailing lists are revised and EG curriculum is completed for next six weeks. Weekly roundtable attendance reaches 30 again for second week.

Contradiction: Handling interruptions as main roads rather than detours.

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Forty appointments are held in relation to the Regional Consult using rural networks. Week is highlighted by pre-Regional Consult workshop on the issues in the arena of education.

Internal: In the midst of 40 appointments and troops spread across the region, the staff is sustained by the Roundtable and a report on Latin America.

Contradiction: Turning those who are excited about the Regional Consult into paid registrants. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN

External: Community Association prepares spaces for revenue-generating activities — archery in the gym basement and electronic games in the Grill backroom. Anthony Paul presents the India story to classes and congregations in Meadville, Pennsylvania.

Internal: Academy tutorial construct releases power of RS-I to small house.

Contradiction: Solidifying enthusiastic participation in major upcoming events — Regional Consult, revenue-generating activities and development. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional Consult takes more commanding charge of the minds and hearts of the regional team and colleagues as The Industrial Labor Relations Center of Cornell University confirms the date of May 8—17 for use of their facilities. Nearby lodging is confirmed, and mailing to 100 key colleagues announcing these facts goes out. Key framing and development appointments continue to open new challenges and possibilities.

Internal: Bob Mayo, senior statesman of the Rochester Guardians, drives youth to Chicago for Youth Presidium and meets with nexus staff regarding the future of the Charlotte Valley Firewood Company.

Contradiction: Completing a set of blueprints, when steps already taken have laid a foundation. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Black Engagement Strategy PSU with 40% of Order's Afro-Americans resolves to create a sign of renewed black engagement in Philadelphia Region and then move on to Washington, Atlanta and the world.

Internal: Youth Cluster returns from Youth Presidium in state of euphoria and dispels all doubt as to their giahhood when they produce a top-notch collegium on short notice.

Contradiction: Structurally breathing hope beyond hope into a society lost in the desert of hopelessness. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Preschool acceleration continues with a second week of staff training which includes field trip to other day-care centers. Phase I celebrates Valentine's Day with Kiddie Disco with 200 in attendance.

Internal: House hosts Jean Smith, Joel Wright, Elaine Johnson and Ben Rose as it experiences again the dynamics of feast or famine as gigantic truckload of frozen and canned food arrives, resulting in food distribution throughout the community.

Contradiction: Discerning the rhythm pattern within the metro that enables Ivy City engagement and metro corporate care. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: A meeting with students and faculty at School for International Training, Brattleboro, Vermont, establishes working relationship with college aimed at service and looking for volunteer placements. Two students are committed to work with the ICA; two more are considering.

Internal: Impromptu Mexican feast Saturday night and a Sri Lankan lunch Sunday prepared by Guardian family Shanmugalingum add spice to hectic Week II.

Contradiction: Seeing through the present moment to what it means in the long range. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Preparation for the winter carnival continues as carnival committee creates "no-snow" alternatives. Starks CYF builds creative proposals for youth engagement. Starks Enterprises Corporation monthly meeting drafts lease agreements and sends off three more funding proposals. Heritage group reviews drawings for historical Starks stationery.

Internal: House celebrates emptiness (fast), fullness (Mardi Gras — a bit early and an evening with five members of the Russell family) and wetness (Janet falls in the mud while carrying large box of kindling).

Contradiction: Coming up with real alternatives for community participation and capital formation. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Royal Bank maintains long-time support with \$3000 donation. CICA Vice-President Fr. Tonchette takes time to visit House and as Guardian meets with Br. Laurier, CSV, who will write an article on ICA for distribution to 900 Montreal religious houses. Women's Workshop of Canadian Pulp and Paper Association takes shape as three women visit House for initial context and plan.

Internal: Monique Le Guillou returns from hospital with both arms working. House recovers foundational understanding of training through four-collegium study.

Contradiction: Holding comprehensive picture in the midst of growing external demands on time and troops. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Toronto core celebrates Training Inc. visit to George Brown College and returns to quarter planning for the Symposium. Symposium date and place are confirmed.

Internal: The 1980 books are closed and ready for the auditor.

Contradiction: Moving at revolutionary pace while depending on establishment authorization. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Second roundtable on the road in Pontiac County brings request to continue on a regular basis. Visits with mayors and key authorization figures affirms that the moment is right for Regional Consult.

Internal: House becomes "three-phased" — celebrating George Yost's 60th birthday with an evening at the local "English" pub and a three-day House family retreat.

Contradiction: Finding the Regional Consult Symposium location to put authority in the statement about this event's cruciality. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX**MEXICO CITY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Donations of well, irrigation equipment, seeder, pump and technical expertise prepares the agriculture demonstration/training plot for planting. Forty-five at guild

meeting are ready and willing to make decisions and carry them out to prepare for large community Assembly this week. New openness for Guatemala funding makes proposal writing an urgent day and night activity.

Internal: Collegiums and conversations on the stylistic disciplines and order dynamics are a refreshing exchange to refocus common life in mission.

Contradiction: Forging consensus at key critical moments when troops are scattered across the geography. (Wk. 5)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Accelerating region takes the form of a circuit to Portland to write proposals for Claverty truck and coffee land, working all week on the Regional Programme design, pulling together demographic data on St. Thomas and Portland Parishes (Blue Mountain HDZ), and mocking-up the Regional Consult brochure and regional flip book. Four hundred wood electric outlets are delivered to Rural Electrification Company and production of charcoal is begun on Co-op Farm. Project collegium discusses role of Woburn Lawn towards the future.

Internal: Collegium room takes on new look with large map of Portland and St. Thomas Parishes; and House journeys to Kingston to drive-in for first movie this year.

Contradiction: Emphasizing Regional Consult preparation in the midst of critical immediate issues. (Wk. 7)

LIMA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Preparation for sewing industry is initiated when Azpitia resident teaches two others pants tailoring. Lima cadre completes weeklong methods course with a mini-celebration and evaluation.

Internal: Eliseo and Geronima Rivas arrive to create an auxiliary representing six nations. Azpitia and auxiliary send Lucy Aponte to assignment in Madrid in drama-filled sendout celebration.

Contradiction: Creating the strategy to build effectively the regional teams. (Wk. 5)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS****BUENOS AIRES****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Conserving industry is launched with test batch of delicious cantaloupe marmalade. New enlarged Consejo (Community Board) welcomes five new members with new marmalade samples. Youth Club does new simplified form of Youth Forum (V model) with enthusiasm. Laying-hen project is resurrected as hens start laying again, and Community Kitchen receives donation of potatoes from community family.

Internal: New Tagore ritual is translated in time for House Church, and House holds two collegiums on Master Strategies of Declaration, Manifestation and Formation.

Contradiction: Creating the images, the time and space designs that enable all to move beyond operating out of day-to-day immediacies. (Wk. 6)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Community sendout from Bananeiras marks a turning point for project. Secretary of Education takes over funding of preschool providing two full teachers' salaries and facility rent. Forum Comunitario Campaign continues!

Internal: Roundtable continues with excitement throughout the House over conversation; and Rosarios celebrate anniversary amidst great fanfare.

Contradiction: Securing a new house in the midst of carnival atmosphere. (Wk. 8)

THE GLOBAL ORDER CENTRUM REPORT

QUARTER III WEEK NINE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports visits to all five nations and six regions of Area Hong Kong net US\$60,000 for January. Area Singapore reports \$35,000 income during Weeks 2 and 3 with a \$5,000 LENS in North Sumatra. Regional House and Nexus team join forces in Kuala Lumpur. The multinational contact list prepared for the Global Development Centrum Band Meeting is being used for effective cross-nation webbing of companies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the tension between being on the road all the time and creating effective advance circuit strategies.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that the participation in preparing for the Kuh Du E Ri HDTS and the presentation of the Fortnight design in Brussels are paralleled in Chicago with the preparation of the Quarter IV Roundtable and the guiding of the Regionalis PSU in Area New York. PSUs, collegiums, studies, Regional Consults, and Talking Papers indirectly bring focus to order forms. The key contradiction lies in the arena of managing to keep Research operating relevantly and with regard for the future as Regional Consults require staffing.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Chicago sets up computer programs for global data on regional programs. Hong Kong creates a Regional Consult Office. Student House sends *Orbiter* to university students and Hong Kong creates interchange packets for houses. Recent statistical analysis shows that 350 persons from 24 nations have participated in the last six sessions of the Global Academy. The key contradiction lies in the arena of continuously feeding the methodological insights and authorization advantages from one Regional Consult to all the others.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports the successful completion of Canadian ICA audit. Chicago Inkind awaits four and one half tons of Campbell Soup products. Hong Kong sends David Elliot for two-week development-computer research trek to Taiwan. Both the USA and Canada are preparing the financial records ahead and presenting them to the auditors for confirmation, saving time and money. The key contradiction lies in the arena of keeping the long-range vision in the midst of overwhelming immediacies.
