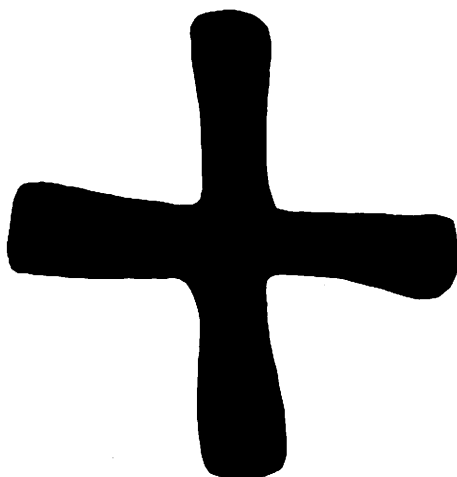

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Circuits to Avila and Segovia Provinces are highlighted with meetings of groups in six different villages and visits with the Bishops of both Segovia and Avila. Public document is printed in kind by 3-M. Ricardo Diez Hochleitue says yes to being on India Exposition Committee and recommends key names on four continents. Set up of post-conference PSU gets seven yeses on first day of phoning. Development trek expands key contacts with American and European multi-nationals.

Internal: House sends out Bill to Copenhagen Consult, Brian and Prabahkar to Brussels after development trek; and Mary Kay goes South to chaperone Senior class trip. House Fast is followed by Sunday breakfast feast.

Contradiction: Turning twenty-hour working day of people in rural areas into victory for implementation of six-month launch plan in Region Madrid. (Wk. 8)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Reflecting the entire year, this week is one of broadening contacts, re-engaging historic colleagues and strengthening the Movement's grasp of its role — all in preparation for Regional Consult.

Internal: With return of six members from Brussels Fortnight, life regains normality for the E.G. and work for Regional Consult is restored with immense vigour.

Contradiction: Living out of realised victory of the next four years rather than frenzy of last minute Consult set-up. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two Xaverian Fathers and a Church of Scotland minister attend first Social Methods event and immediately declare these tools as relevant to their work. During the week one participant calls to say she has invited friends for other sessions.

Internal: House gets finances in order before sending Stuart out, yet again, to another event—the London Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Involving "old hands" in the momentum started with Social Methods event. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Tai'rgwaith circuit succeeds in publishing May issue of *Tai'rgwaith Vision* with new help in distributing to all of village. Preparation begins for Ferndale documentation module to mark fourth anniversary of their 450-person Town Meeting.

Internal: Deanna Hickey's 12th birthday is celebrated at House Church. House warming party provides occasion to meet some new neighbours.

Contradiction: Cranking up appropriate "event-filledness" before summer "lull" sets in. (Wk. 6)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Four Paris regional colleagues attend closing of Formation Fortnight in Brussels — the Demonstration Symposium called *The Urban Challenge*. Critical preparation for local program takes step forward with a three-evening *Forum Communautaire* orchestrator training in French.

Internal: Jeff and Jean Baptiste return from three and a half weeks in Brussels. Edith lands new temporary work contract with O.E.C.D. for seven weeks, giving self-support a boost.

Contradiction: Creating clear realistic tactics that care for all strategies from now until quarter's end in midst of a continually changing universe. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: French election has direct missional implications with appointment of an Exposition Committee member

* NOTE: The * indicates the first printing of a new report.

(Senator Pisani) as EEC commissioner for development and a reference to the new minister of foreign affairs in France. Self-support contacts with Petro Fina disclose new leads for Development.

Internal: Feast closing the Fast with reports from two Consults and Ascension Day family discontinuity refresh everyone. Response of Fortnight graduate to invitation to work on Consult pull-together gives Operations Centrum a Day 1 troop for a week.

Contradiction: Separating issues to be dealt with in Week 10 Order Council and July Global Council to allow for relaxed reflection on the year at Continental gathering. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House doubles in size with Schrijnen's return from Amsterdam. Regional team completes Consult publicity with mailing.

Internal: Office redesigned and redecored in face of Regional Consult coming in two weeks.

Contradiction: Discerning single focus of Regional Consult preparation. (Wk. 9)*

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Team completes translation of Regional Consult document. Development circuit in Frankfurt Region pulls together several years of development contact history to decide on new focus for the future. House team reviews momentum developing in seven metros in the two months since the Regional Consult.

Internal: Tim Casswell and Anne-Marie Murphy arrive in a house with three adults and five children, giving adults an even chance with the other adults assigned to Amsterdam Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Using new reality in Metro to undergird global development. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week is filled full with events of Regional Consult Assembly, document writing, celebrating a birthday with a Dutch colleague and sending out a colleague family to a new residence in Belgium.

Internal: Facing the end of the year, self-support task force builds plan for closing year in black through odd-job and handyman work. New teaching possibilities are uncovered that have regional, continental and global implications for self-support.

Contradiction: Designing implementing steps into a regional and self-support plan when future is still an unfocused picture of possibility. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Appointments for Regional Consult make visible international character of Rome as referrals continue to put team in contact with global organizations. Requests for methods training next year come in from two religious groups who had people in April Seminar. Retired Italian Exxon executive (first met at American Club of Rome meeting) meets with team, hears ICA story, says yes to being on Board of Advisors, and makes three contacts for team to Regional Consult.

Internal: British Petroleum gives House file cabinet inkind, and Youth Cluster creates fantastic file system on Rome religious orders and organizations.

Contradiction: Getting word on Regional Consult out to enough organizations to enable Symposium to be catalytic event that puts ICA into a new orbit with public and private sectors as the Seminars did with the voluntary (religious orders). (Wk. 7)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Team picks up and distributes 200 brochures to contacts and colleagues. Weekend PSU on Regional Consult procedures clarifies intent and direction of Consult. Mr. Genberg from Swedish Co-operative Center reports favorably from site visit in Machos District (Kenya) and releases second installment of grant.

Internal: Final guest room renovation in House enables Regional Consult team to be under one roof.

Contradiction: Discerning long-term advantages for Movement which can be capitalized on by the Regional Consult. (Wk. 7)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Water System Team shifts to Sheikh Ali to begin installation of third water system in cluster. Authorization team meets with local council to confirm work plan for 1981-82.

Internal: Victories of last four and a half years bring demands for resident veterinarian in Bayad and necessitate ICA staff move from Clinic quarters by June 15. Great celebration dramatizes stories from past surrounding life in Clinic housing.

Contradiction: Consensing and confirming House relocation plans with minimal adjustment of quarter plan. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: National Symposium on *Integrated Local Development in the Eighties*, co-sponsored by the Adult Education Department, is held at the University of Lagos. Eighty people representing all four sectors form tremendous potential for program breakloose and support. Teams return from two successful sponsored-sets: eleven villages in Cross River State sponsored by Nigerian Rubber Board and five villages in Bendel State sponsored by Gulf Oil.

Internal: Listening to tape-recording of Professor Udekwo's powerful, spirit-filled Symposium address is eye in hurricane of frenzied, celebrative activity following the event.

Contradiction: Finding the energy in the form of local and voluntary forces to actualize immediate tasks. (Wk. 8)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Workdays in the twelve expansion villages yield twelve plazas prepared and awaiting inkind signboards. Development team brings in K1,200.

Internal: "Civilizing process" strikes again as electrification lights up auxiliary house and generator is installed. Charity and daughter Nimo arrive as new sojourners.

Contradiction: Forging models and consensus for doing both Kapini and circuits. (Wk. 6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Eight hundred fifty-six village leaders participate in 15 training programmes: Health, Education, Leader's meetings, Village Leader's Institute, GWF, WAMS, and Village Meetings. A scheme of the Ministry of Agriculture, Muvuti Co-operative Society and ICA laying out six-month plan to upgrade 900 farmers is to be initiated with three-day "Farmer's Agriculture Conference" with two agriculture guild farmers from each of the 34 villages. Regional Consult begins final push as first ten registrations arrive and next week's registration blitz is finalized.

Internal: House receives two volunteers from London who are quickly consumed by huge operational machinery. House receives good news of Kaye Hayes' upturn in health battle.

Contradiction: Inventing wisdom necessary to co-ordinate and pull off both the new happening of Locational Consult as well as Regional Consult. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Nexus Consult teams participate in brings to successful conclusion the round of six Regional Consults and three cluster village consults. Calcutta and Pune Consults end and Jawale Cluster Project takes off. Development team commits auditor to doing a week's development on his own contacts, and hosts successful CODEL site visit to Chikhale.

Internal: Nexus celebrates Ronnie Seagren's 33rd birthday with banana splits. Raganat Jadhav shows off his new custom-built orthopaedic shoes.

Contradiction: Pushing through on significant cluster key-stone actuation in arenas of irrigation, training school and Maliwada school repairs, before monsoon hits. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Evidence of significant income increase in village of Sikror is witnessed in ten new tractors, five threshing machines and eight hand-pumps. Rajeev Narula's father helps him raise Rs 1,000 in one day for HDTI participation — six successful calls out of six!

Internal: House finds itself sustained through painting family rooms, and brooding on global assignments and marks of the journey with global collegiums.

Contradiction: Maximising corporate input into the fine details that make all the difference. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Ten register for HDTI in Maliwada. Four-year Nadlapur report is sent to forty guardians. Electric meter and telephone line supplies arrive for planned Gram Panchayat building. Foundation is laid for village water-system pump-house. Work in thirty village zone is initiated with four base-line surveys. Forty-two people apply for vocational skills programs.

Internal: House sends out K. Samson to teach HDTI and D. Holmes to Calcutta LENS. Padma Mallaram arrives with new baby girl, Sita. In-kind nets 20 meters of blue cloth and Rs.201.

Contradiction: Clarifying needed role and style. (Wk. 9)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Regional team completes writing of Regional Consult document and does four-month maneuvers and timeline for initiation of new four-year strategic directions.

Internal: House celebrates completion of Regional Consult with in-kind Chinese meal. Three-day discontinuity begins with viewing of the film *Kranti*.

Contradiction: Focusing four-year strategic directions and four-month maneuvers into practical implementation design for Quarter IV. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Nexus hosts Kuala Lumpur Regional Consult team and participates in Regional Consult debriefing.

Internal: New stove arrives too late to cook dinner, giving House opportunity for great Chinese dinner out.

Contradiction: Keeping up lines of communications with all Nexus members to enable thought through follow-up of quarter plans. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: *National Conference on Human Development in the '80s in Rural Malaysia* (Regional Consult) is victorious advance for Kuala Lumpur Region—130 at Symposium, 30 on Research Practicum and 40 attending Planning Assembly. National frame is fortified, regional program possibilities expand beyond wildest dreams and there are many new metro colleagues.

Internal: House continues to be hosted by Nexus during wrap-up of Conference loose ends. Two-day discontinuity is physically reviving after hard push of past few months.

Contradiction: Grasping approach to Conference follow-up that maintains great advantages in the field, while realistically planning for diminished House troops during June-July. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Fourth Regional Consult in Area Singapore is launched as 89 participants join in historic Bandung (provincial capital) for Global Symposium. This signals new depth of working with public and private sectors. Bontoa and Kelapa Dua villagers are local sector presence.

Internal: Regional Consult preparation team celebrates before the victory with evening in Jakarta—special tour of Bugis wooden sea-going sailing ships, dramatizing difference between old Jakarta (Betawi) and rest of Java.

Contradiction: Insuring crucial continuity during Regional Consult, especially in arena of new funding services for zone development crunch. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Representatives from local bank, agricultural agencies and irrigation department meet in Bontoa to start ball rolling for *palawija* (cash crop) module. Sixteen youth meet to plan priorities, resulting in repaired soccer field. All Regional Consult reports and thank-you's are delivered to officials.

Internal: H. A. Latief, Head of Parliament, drops in Sunday morning to get a Regional Assembly document. Visitors Chris and Trevor Goode lead collegium on travels through India, Burma and Indonesia before being sent out to Australia. House celebrates Joseph McCabe's second birthday.

Contradiction: Enabling leadership of cluster villages to take responsibility and initiative for own miracles. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nexus spreads itself to enable Regional Consults in Japan, Hong Kong Regional task force Town Meeting set-up, two global film showings, and a fine LENS in Hong Kong with Gillmons Office Supply.

Internal: Coming together of Nexus team allows great collegium an occasion for quarter Roundtable celebration.

Contradiction: In midst of much to be done, discerning bottom line which will release total victory in the regions. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: House experiences program bonanza with four events in one weekend — Hong Kong's first multi-national corporation LENS, all-Chinese Community Forum (with three more scheduled), a film show, and sending one staff member to Japan for a Regional Consult.

Internal: Auxiliary's sense of being "only four" is exploded as all are sent out to three different locations and find the colleagues to make the programs happen.

Contradiction: Structuring July Order Council into regional program momentum so that it is an intentional break and not a gap. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Team finds accommodating printer who offers fast quality printing of Symposium brochure as well as his assistance in the future. Team sends out Symposium invitations. Images for summer youth program get enthusiastic responses from school and government officials.

Internal: Team completes HDTs manual, bound in notebooks to be ready for use in next one. Two site visits this week and at least one anticipated next week inspire thorough House and Community Center cleaning.

Contradiction: Taking three cultures, three main languages, various educational backgrounds, and numerous individual characteristics and merging them into an effective, fully engaged House team. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development follow-up continues to roll with calls to Chinese companies and proposals submitted for NT\$200,000. Symposium confirmations come in as recruitment pushes ahead.

Internal: Highlight of week is study of Panchayat talking-papers — *Polity* and *Symbolic life*. Meeting on Regional Consult clarifies procedures.

Contradiction: Keeping all fronts moving to wrap-up year while being conscious of summer program possibilities for Hai Ou and creating opportunities for next year in program, development and self-support. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Team does follow-up on fourth LENS held this year and gets confirmation on fifth LENS to be held in 1981-82. Three companies call with checks prepared before they are listed on committed board. Development raises yearly goal by mid-May concluding a year of full program checks for each month of 1980-81. Team initiates new joint ventures in economic enterprises of clothing industries, rock industry and fish farming.

Internal: House sends four to weekend Imaginal Education Module in Sudtonggan for training teachers of 34 preschools, teaching 2,000 children with total faculty of 69. Manila House is location for debriefing, skits and celebrative songs for Order in the Philippines at end of national Odyssey—including trip to Banawe and Baguie. Executive board meeting at House exhibits mood of Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Directing the growing Movement here with appropriate sense of timing. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Team receives bagrass seedling from Lapanday worth 1,000 seeds. Team re-schedules Agriculture Training in Bansalan. Langub receives sewing order from Gaisano Inc. for dusters and short pants. Division Two Preschool classes open with T-shirt uniforms and picture taking. La Paz HDP has new Preschool teacher.

Internal: House sends Lester out to Manila and then Chicago for Global Council. New village representative is in La Paz HDP.

Contradiction: Finding way to deal with high cost of bagrass seedling transportation. (Wk. 8)*

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Cathay Pacific Airways grants 1,000,000 yen in air travel for the third year. First meeting of church colleagues in four years is held at House. Visits are made to four key government friends.

Internal: House sojourner, Fumiyo Tabira, announces intention to serve as one-year ICA volunteer in Southeast Asia. Brad Clark, Don's son, arrives for three-month visit and immediately begins work teaching English.

Contradiction: Maintaining high level of coordination among four regions in a highly coordinated nation. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUH DU E RI

External: Seoul Region looks back on explosive chain of events as Regional Consult closes. Talk on Human Development by Kuh Du I Ri Village Chief, Mr. Choi, highlights Symposium held in Hyatt Regency Hotel. Research Practicum breaks open Korea with new colleagues and new knowledge of geography. Planning Assembly held in Kuh Du E Ri rounds off week.

Internal: Russell Jewell's twenty-first birthday is celebrated with musical entertainment and skits at closing celebration of Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Bringing separate guardians together as corporate group. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Dream comes true as Uyemura Kogyo Company rents two rooms at House and plans to send its employees for three-month periods of resident training with ICA. House sends Miss Tanaka as colleague from Osaka Region to join ICA staff in Tokyo.

Internal: ICA staff spends Golden Week in retreat at Fukuoka House. Patricia Bray arrives from Memphis to join Osaka staff as sojourner.

Contradiction: Allocating enough time in all missional arenas to make sure everything done is victorious. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Team reopens three metros (Aomori, Sendai and Fukushima) after two-year absence. Team makes initial visits to former key colleagues during Regional Consult Practicum week.

Internal: Visit to Hokkaido Shrine (the most important Shinto holy place in the Region) inspires witness on "The Religious."

Contradiction: Capturing imaginations with clear idea of the Regional Consult. (Wk. 8)*

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: LENS with Helping Hand Mission in North Sydney is first with voluntary sector and third LENS in Area Sydney in four weeks. Qantas Airways agrees to June LENS and will pay \$1,000 cash and \$9,000 in tickets. Team receives \$6,000 from Public Service Board of South Australia for LENS; they report the Management Committee has decided to implement immediately all the maneuvers. LENS is requested and subsequently scheduled for Catholic Mission School on Bathurst Island, Northern Territory, June 11-13 for 31 participants, 16 white and 15 Aboriginal. Second Community LENS in Darwin for June 18-20 looks good.

Internal: Youth are sent to Youth PSU in Melbourne for "fine event." Telakaus' two-year Temporary Resident visas are approved. One car dies, leaving only one healthy.

Contradiction: Maintaining program momentum and enthusiasm, and handling actual requests for LENS in July and August, when all trained LENS faculty from Area and Nexus are due to be out during that period. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE

External: Core meeting of eight grounds six contradictions and begins on proposals. "Prayer meeting" is held with care workers over easy-money jobs. Team posts 70 letters to Lake Cargelligo residents for work-shop. T.A.F.E. Aboriginal Office talks seriously about Adult Education.

Internal: House pauses as Fast Day follows Bobby Sands' death and uses Gandhi readings which give deep reflection to non-doing day.

Contradiction: Developing a corporate community team so that replacements can be trained to fill the holes. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Team mails Regional Consult Report and Newsletter to 440 people. New Perth colleague, fresh from Darwin LENS, is setting up one-day planning sessions for teachers all over state, claiming, "There's nobody else doing this kind of thing!" Heather Umbagai stops in before leaving for Kalgoorlie Hospital to complete her nurse's training.

Internal: Roundtable study of Introduction to *Shaping The Coming Age of Religious Life* excites House; and E.G. invites adults to their fiesta (featuring a crocodile pinatal) after study of Latin America.

Contradiction: Forcing the Devil to "tip over his king" in the quest to get another Perth LENS on the boards. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: On-the-road circuit begins to set up Practicum events for Regional Consult. In-town circuit does evening calls for Symposium contacts as registrations continue to come in.

Internal: Whole House reunites on Saturday to celebrate cold spell with broken water heater and travels around town to find suitable "tavern" ending up at one just down the street from the House.

Contradiction: Seeing through demands to keys for engaging the Region. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Marsha and Roy Stansbury and Ann Epps enable House to do thirty appointments for development and Regional Consult recruitment. The Stegley Foundation approves \$4,000 grant for Murrin Bridge extension.

Internal: Adelaide and Sydney Youth Clusters and five other youth join in weekend PSU on cluster life and responsibilities of youth in today's society.

Contradiction: Creating count-down timeline that maximises troop and time effectiveness for Regional Consult. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Global film is mailed to Hughenden (1,350 km.) for local people to screen, as drought-breaking rains close many roads across the State. Regional Core workshops Consult brochure, using many fine products from other regions and results of House collegium.

Internal: House holds two collegiums on new forms for the "Wonder" and writes letter to the Panchayat in response.

Contradiction: Discovering life story that the Global Consult is an event of depth participation for Queensland. (Wk. 8)*

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Baileys visit and are excited about Apia Regional Plan for 1981-82. Area Pacific Training Institute is targeted for Tonga, Fiji and Agana, and brochure is drafted. Dean of University of the Pacific proposes cooperative village extension project between ICA and USP because of success of Salani Taro Industry. Regional circuit works on securing LENS in Tonga.

Internal: Mary Laura is sent out to Sydney Regional Consult and to meet Marilyn Whiting in Tonga for Regional Circuit. Great celebration with the Baileys includes barbecue with steak and chicken.

Contradiction: Finishing debriefing visits with all 120 Symposium participants while iron is still hot. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AUCKLAND

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: A 44-hour PSU on the Family with whole House and regional colleagues provides objectivity on the journey, challenges families in today's society and creates responses by those families present as well as by the Movement. PSU reveals that corporate objectivity is the way to deal with the family struggle.

Internal: Inkind food system is again established and regularly provides good supplies which allows money from food budget to assist self-support. Collegium on Spirit Methods from the *IMAGE* recalls profundity and power of these methods for these times.

Contradiction: Creating objective models to give direction in midst of many subjective concerns and images relative to the next weeks and months. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Completion of Metro Lab week brings openness of human services to Region. Assembly is held in significant Hispanic signal community with 41 people attending; 12 Hispanic women from Norwood Elementary School attend first night. California strategy timeline and willingness to participate by every sector are produced out of Assembly.

Internal: Twenty colleagues around the table release imaginative constructs for future strategies. Abundance of food and materials are inkinded, and many celebrations happen during week.

Contradiction: Struggling to find new ways of moving and giving form to imagination to keep up momentum. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHGROVE

External: Regional Consult Document is printed in kind by Arizona State University and Phoenix newspaper pays for 2,000 copies of Consult Summary. Portales Task Force for Small Town Survival Net (Assembly campaign) gets underway with organizational meeting. Good week for development.

Internal: House empties out as Chris Williams and St. Clairs are sent out along with Marian Emerson and Carla Reed, and fills up again as Russ Manning and Susan Torok move in as sojourners.

Contradiction: Deciding strategic direction as post-Consult offers and possibilities open up, rather than what is merely easy. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PISINEMO

External: Papago Town Meeting Campaign is underway with No. 4 in Big Fields Village—held in Papago language with Pisinemo residents and Tribal Community Development leadership.

Internal: Memorial Day celebration is followed by three evenings of module preparation.

Contradiction: Making good on promise to provide accommodations for Training School participants. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Twenty-three people arrive for regional gathering with Kazantzakis liturgy, regional scenarios, artform creation, and visit to amusement park. Development team lands two new givers and a LENS in Boulder. Moffat, Colorado, sets Town Meeting dates for September and October. Olive-Ann Slotta is sent out for two-week assignment in Vancouver.

Internal: Two House Youth receive awards for Mathematics and Language. Three colleagues host three House families for Memorial Day picnics.

Contradiction: Organizing summer operating modes when summer started last week. (Wk. 9)*

External: Thursday evening "urban visit" of twenty colleagues from Central MacDougal community discloses window into sustaining primal community. Each brings gift from city to celebrate *urban*.

Internal: Picnic celebration "stiffens the sinews" of 27 weary players as marathon football game finally ends with a score.

Contradiction: Getting pieces of puzzle put together, so all can catch a look when heading out the door. (Wk. 8)

External: Preparation for CICA Board Meeting continues with Regional team painting collegium room, staging social event and netting four yeses for event. Brandon again proves to be fertile Metro in week of development.

Internal: House welcomes Anthony back from Academy staff. Yard is raked and mowed, and flowers are planted to enhance style of House.

Contradiction: Getting regional vision worked through for next year and the role of CICA Board Meeting in implementing that vision. (Wk. 9)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Area Council held in Memphis combines celebration and retreat dynamics with work of the Council. Key event of Council is study of Vocational Journey Chart with the Panchayat.

Internal: House celebrates graduation of Claire Clements and Patricia Henschen with celebrative event symbolizing rite of passage. Reflection of past year is held with metro colleagues. Claire Clements is sent out for Summer to Chicago and from there to Washington, D.C. for Presidential reception being held in her honor.

Contradiction: Moving forward with prioritized determination without being consumed by minutia. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ASHERTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIAHOMA**

External: House spends whole week and completes documentation of Regional Conference just in time to attend Area Council, followed by great weekend celebration of the Indiahoma Festival which includes T.V. coverage. Hundreds come to Indiahoma from all over Texas, Oklahoma, and even Germany. Indiahoma hosts first non-military Volksmarch in Oklahoma.

Internal: Rebecca finishes her first grade year on the honor roll, has end-of-year piano recital, and makes last presentation in gymnastics class. House participates in Volksmarch and completes 70 km. total for the community.

Contradiction: Figuring out catalytic action for a whole quarter when only a few weeks of presence remains. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Kamela Parekh and Memphis staff host thirty members of First Congregational Church of Christ for an Indian dinner and global film evening. Memphis Metro core reflects on Regional Consult document and decides to find a way to provide spirit care to service networks. St. John United Methodist Church finds facility for RS-I scheduled for June 19-21. George Howard and Molly Shaw lead issues and recommendations workshops at White House Conference on Aging in Mississippi.

Internal: Three colleagues offer keys to apartments and a church for hosting Area Council. Memphis Regional Team hosts Area Houston's "Cel-re-con" (celebration-retreat-council) and makes interminable list of highlights from the event (call or write and ask us!).

Contradiction: Holding tension between this quarter's regional tactics and global demands in catalyzing colleague engagement. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Weekend PSU polishes document and sends it to typist. DHHR representative visits Charity Hospital Quality Work Life Team to see about expansion to other state agencies. Consult Summary Report is printed to use in Dialogue gatherings and report to Region. Evenings at the Institute are scheduled for three Tuesdays in June with invitations to all Consult interviewees, contacts and participants.

Internal: Phoebe Reynolds arrives, impacting House with objective presence and personal contacts to help recruit RS-I. Area Council cares for spirit of all, symbolized by Panchayat taking Council through Vocational Journey Chart.

Contradiction: Creating plans, in midst of everything else, to care for arrival of Japanese friends. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Work on Consult document continues as Joyce returns from Area Council in Memphis and Sushila goes to visit family in San Jose, California, for two weeks.

Internal: Collegium on Order Foundation requires dictionary at hand and stimulates hard thinking. Youth receive award for participation in Crew (State Champs) and begins rounds of events which lead to graduation for Liz and Cari.

Contradiction: Focusing on task of document completion while handling all the excitement related to graduation plans and activities. (Wk. 9)*

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Guatemala City holds three great LENS with broadened authorization forces. Team from Chicago Nexus participates in Ottawa Regional Consult. Relationships with Historic Church continue through dialogue with Norman E. Dewire, Executive Director of General Council on Ministries of the United Methodist Church and with attendance of clergy staff at their Annual Conferences.

Internal: Delightful afternoon visit by Mr. and Mrs. Soedjai of Indonesia brings a breath of global collegiality in the midst of intensified nitty-gritty.

Contradiction: Completing past year's work while maintaining momentum toward new configurations and tasks. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Community Service Forum with Archdiocese of Chicago and Mini-LENS with Custer High school staff initiate focus on program marketing. 5th City Business Careers begins teaching computer curriculum. Bethany Hospital breaks ground for new hospital on 3444 campus.

Internal: Celebrative week with two birthdays, one graduation, and annual Memorial Day Picnic at the Ayres provides fantastic interlude for House.

Contradiction: Discerning clear images of next steps for formulating metro colleague engagement by Fall. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Regional "inner circle" list of 100 is completely computerized in-house with personalized letter capability.

Internal: Rhoda Ertle visits for ten days and House has in-depth corporate look at next year through collegium on assignments.

Contradiction: Setting aside time from interviewing to set appointments for interviews of people beyond immediate circle. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: Centrum, Area and Regional troops meet to plan Rural Venture (RVI) project. Forty in region are doing interviews. Development team visits 38 churches in 11 days—\$1,630 in hand, \$16,000 committed. Twenty-seven businesses participate in Lorimor's third annual Heritage Day.

Internal: Regional team meets in Lorimor for final planning of the Regional Consult.

Contradiction: Holding tension of designing RVI project and Regional Consult. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Decision is made to include a Symposium event as one of the activities of regional evaluation. *Partnerships for Human Development, Anniversary Symposium* (ten years in the Upper-Midwest: ICA) will occur June 27th in Minneapolis. Invitation is printed to go to 5,000 colleagues.

Internal: Minneapolis Regional Team celebrates cloudy Memorial Day at the park, with hamburgers served between hearty volleyball games. Ages 11 to 55 are represented.

Contradiction: Collaborating need, opportunity and strategy factors to get the most out of all events and contacts, particularly the Symposium. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Symposium "happens" with 61 people, weaving together prominent recognized leaders of all sectors, producing a truly "new movemental" event. Four thousand dollars is developed from corporations; registration fees cover cost of event itself. Pre-Practicum Think Tank breaks loose mandates and articulates initial strategic directions.

Internal: House and colleagues celebrate Symposium, the city's uniqueness, and Bill Gooch's birthday by having a ball game, an Art and International Festival and barbecue picnic with Camp Fire Girl, Elaine Stover, starting fire by rubbing two sticks together, at the Forest Park Zoo.

Contradiction: Orchestrating Practicum Week to reflect the emergence of new movement. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Regional Consult is completed with over 75 percent new people participating; all four sectors, minorities, towns, and cities are represented, giving strong geographic and socio-economic coverage of Detroit Region. Total of 300 region-wide Metro Practicum interviews bring highlight report to Assembly. Mandates receive over-whelming "yes".

Internal: Margaret and Matthew Kraus from Lorimor hold down command post during Metro Practicum. Consult expands regional team, covering all metros.

Contradiction: Objectifying already full sense of Regional Consult accomplishment in face of unformed data and stories. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Cleveland Metro Core hosts and enables Cleveland Regional Council. Cuyahoga Community College "Community Resources" course formally ends with decision to continue as Central Neighborhood Core Group. Tour of three demonstration neighborhoods and documentation of the year's work in all metros are Council highlights.

Internal: Regional House team has four members assigned to Chicago and St. Louis while holding Regional Council at Cleveland House.

Contradiction: Daring to start new things while facing unknown onrush of summer. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Training, Inc. opens with full roster of 34 trainees and five full-time staff.

Internal: ICA and Youth Cluster activities rate full page in Shortridge High School Yearbook.

Contradiction: Managing scattered availability of metro colleagues in bringing off a heavy June of program activities. (Wk. 9)*

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: White Plains Circuit develops follow-up interview format when delivering *Dialogue One* document that elicits profound response on next steps and future partnership.

Internal: Break in house search for Memorial Day visit to Greenwich Village Sidewalk Art Show and picnic in Riverside Park uses old muscles in volleyball, softball and badminton games.

Contradiction: Nailing down missional directions for next four years in concrete programs and partnerships while pursuing both long-range and temporary house search. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WIDEN

External: Telling Widen story in one community raises question of "What can we do?" Plans are underway for Community Forum in September.

Internal: Faulty water valve requires shutting off house water for a day, but it provides clearest water in years.

Contradiction: Building enthusiasm among the Regional team to build momentum among the Movement to launch next year running. (Wk. 9)*

Contradiction: Walking slowly and intentionally into the '80s, pacing regional team for The Long March. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: People involved with Living Room Dialogue come to Evening at the Institute and respond to global presentation by volunteering to do-development and engage in methods training.

Internal: Quarter IV internal planning recreates House sense of time as grounding in the Word continues with story section of *Christ of History* paper.

Contradiction: Demonstrating hope in a time of watching and waiting in midst of fear of the future manifesting itself as fatalism. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Work is done in three states as Evenings with the Institute happen in Laconia, New Hampshire, and Martha's Vineyard, Maine, enlivening distant relationships and setting stage for program next year. Week II in Starks prepares section of Cornshop for rented warehouse space. "Brick Steamer" pottery business prepares to open.

Internal: Additional boarder is secured for June/July—clerk of the Presbytery from West Collingswood, New Jersey—in town for graduate theological course. Celtics win 14th NBA championship providing celebration in midst of threatened school closings and layoffs.

Contradiction: Determining best way to care for five people from region about to finish the Academy. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Starks residents continue push on community improvement in May through fourth Saturday workday and day-long participation in ACCION (Micro-Enterprise Development Corporation) sponsored workshop. House acts as consultant for Rural Venture sheep farming project in New Hampshire, agency forum in Bangor and agency guild in Augusta. Colleagues and contacts emerge from global film showing to church youth group, participation in two Hunger Project events and a meeting with a Maine state representative.

Internal: House celebrates with post-workday movies at Starks residents' home, and hosts the Rev. George Moore family and members of church youth group for workday. Reflection on death of fourth hunger striker in Northern Ireland and first planting of house garden on Fast Day impact House.

Contradiction: Struggling to find the breakthrough rather than predisposing to keep on keeping on. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Conversation with *Commission Scolaire de Saint-Jean* results in full four-sector city-level Regional Consult for next winter.

Internal: House celebrates completion of *Atlantic Potential Conference* with fondu bourguignon on Victoria Day after Area Fast.

Contradiction: Creating major framing strategy for long-range catalytic action in midst of many interesting program possibilities. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Twelve issues and ten mandates for southern Ontario are consensed on by 130 delegates with solid cross-sector input. One thousand follow-up Assembly brochures are mailed, reporting on Symposium and launching four-week Practicum. Two days of calling on Symposium participants and old contacts produces LENS with United Church high-rise apartments and sets LENS date for Massey-Ferguson top executives.

Internal: Five from Area New York come to Symposium symbolising decision to work region to region. Ted Farrar turns 40 during Symposium (but not as a result of it). Everyone enjoys strategy weekend in hotel.

Internal: House celebrates 32nd anniversary of ordination into Christian Ministry for George Yost. House experiences Emerging Generation dynamic with Mira Fisher and Brian as part of House dynamic.

Contradiction: Weaving together concern for quality in Regional Consult event with quantity of participation so that impact reaches well into future. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: First harvesting of tomatoes on demonstration farm dramatizes new benefits of irrigation and new agriculture methods with beautiful fruit twice the size of local production. Community leaders host Governor in Conacaste and discuss plans for economic and social development in state of El Progreso. First of three LENS courses begins for Kellogg's Company executives in old capital of Antigua.

Internal: Jim Kelly arrives from Chile and Carlos Zervigon from New Orleans to do LENS. Collegium in Spanish on New Orleans Regional Consult gives Guatemalan Auxiliary first-hand account of the great event.

Contradiction: Maintaining daily nitty-gritty actions as critical to enabling the quarter's victories. (Wk. 7)*

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: *Jamaican Potential* is held April 24 to May 1 with 100 participants from the four sectors at Symposium, 1300 people interviewed and in the forums during the Practicum and with 75 people in the Assembly from all 14 Parishes of the nation. Consult follow-up begins immediately with frame visits, document production and forum set-up. Woburn Lawn holds powerful CEM during Practicum week with celebration for 300 people including Minister of Youth and Community Development. Many new colleagues emerge and a four-sector delegation to July Council in Chicago begins to take shape.

Internal: House "does the nation" through National Consultation, hosts global team, celebrates after Consult at the Courtleigh Manor Hotel and re-configures for House Church in Woburn Lawn.

Contradiction: Building catalytic strategy which will enable National Strategy to be implemented by the four sectors. (Wk. 6)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Forty-five participants representing five nations and four regions in Area Lima complete three-week Community Reformulation Laboratory. Guardians join participants and Azpitia villagers to celebrate closing of school.

Internal: Continental faculty completes evaluation and documentation of school experience, seeing it as effective and flexible tool for creating teams of local people concerned with Human Development. House welcomes sojourners from Patevilca, Peru. Sol de Septiembre, Chile, and Barlovento, Venezuela.

Contradiction: Projecting action into coming year to close gap in missional vision. (Wk. 7)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Eight graduates of Lima GMS return full of excitement. Barlovento T-shirts arrive and are in high demand. Large number of local volunteers help to pour half of ceiling of second building of new Training Center. ICA staff attends ground-breaking for Marcel Rainville's new church which is also attended by Rafael Caldera, former president of Venezuela.

Contradiction: Utilizing effectively the sudden flow of troops (Lima 8, Barlovento Team 20, Dartmouth 5, Yale 1, Guardian Youth 2) during summer months. (Wk. 8)*

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Commission for third anniversary holds second lively meeting and plans ways for event to be self-sufficient. Development sends proposals to Caracas for consideration by companies with branches in Santiago. Consejo (Community Board) discusses implications and actions on other side of fine meeting with Alcalde (Mayor) of Lampa about future of Community Center.

Internal: House experiences session on working paper "Order Foundations" as refreshing.

Contradiction: Building bridges to the future in spite of experienced cut-off-ness. (Wk. 8)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: One municipal forum comes off with representatives from every family at the meeting. Two other forums are set up for coming week. Development visits five companies resulting in commitments from four.

Internal: Contract is secured for House with the mayor assuring monthly rent.

Contradiction: Confirming needed maneuvers for municipal development while phasing the four-year regional activities and programs. (Wk. 8)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports two significant calls to the Ford Foundation in New York City, one Board of Directors and one vice-president indicate all green lights for major proposal package. A guardian family gives \$10,000 for July Global Council. EEC gives \$48,000 to Zambia and Dow Pacific call provides opportunity to strategize Korean project grant. Inking of public piece printing in Europe and Annual Report printing and negatives in US indicate private sector's continued participation in ICA work. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding effective means in each region to locate responsibility for meeting the year's bottom line as attention is turned toward July Global Council.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports Brussels works on Catalysis Talking Paper and Servan Schreiber's *The Global Challenge*, while Hong Kong studies Panchayat Papers. Singapore staffs Jakarta Regional Consult. Chicago moves on wrap-up of the year with University PSU in Indianapolis, two Structural Permeation Lab debriefings and Week II task force on *IMAGE* No. 3. Brooding continues on issues related to July program and the long-range future. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pulling together the phenomenal wisdom of the year into helpful corporate learnings for July.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports all Centrum locations are pulling together data from Regional Consults. All three areas in Singapore Zone, Singapore Nexus and Hong Kong Nexus combine forces to staff Area Sydney Regional Consults. LENS faculty in Hong Kong Zone grows in size as a company LENS allows new facilitator training. Finesse at Consults increases and objectifies vision in Europe. Hong Kong's reflections on Regional Consult and LENS point to images of new spirit of these times — moment of readiness and hope-filled response. Esso Kuala Lumpur indicates desire for continuing relationship. The key contradiction lies in the arena of pulling the wisdom from Regional Consults into helpful corporate learnings.

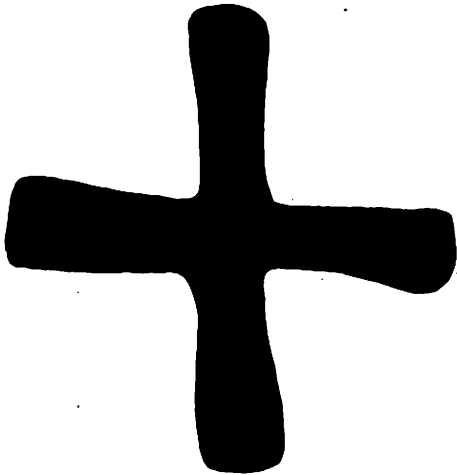
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Report accounting for EEC El Bayad Community Center Grant has been completed in Brussels Nexus along with analysis of HDP economic project status in Chicago Nexus. External: Grant of £5,000 from Rank Xerox "suddenly" appears after six-month prayer vigil, breaking way for three additional contributions gratefully acknowledged. Two community workers who saw social methods at work during Regional Consult spend late but exciting evening with House creating methods for a conference of secondary school teachers in the borough. 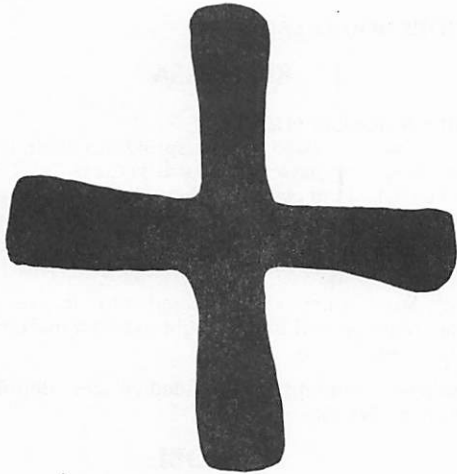
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning how to get yearly committed pledge monies in hand within the next two weeks and breaking open new donors.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports *IMAGE* number 3 reaches its final phases in being printed and available by August 2. June has produced a large number of House PSU's as well as opportunities for corporate reflection on the future. A documentation task force is in the process of putting all Regional Consult issues, mandates and strategic directions on the computer to enable having the written data manageable with speed. The Global Council of three-week length is designed to be a model for area and regional councils; the bookends of four days each include socio-spirit exercises, ten work session days, two days of priorship training, and a rhythm of casual and formal celebrations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the continuation of research systems during June to August as all efforts are put into keeping the whole Nexus House functioning and joining into the work of the Global Council.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the completion of Regional Consults across the globe signals the end of a quarter and produces many program possibilities already for Quarter I. Global Operations Chicago prepares for Global Council by pulling together data, space and constructs. Brussels reports a breakthrough in turning Consult proposals into advantages with the I.E.R.R. PSU and company consultancy proposals in U.K. The key contradiction lies in the arena of transiting from the program of Quarter IV to Quarter I without losing input critical to program of next three months.

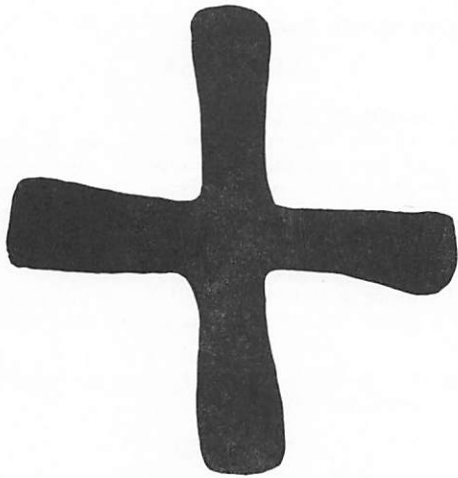
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the arrival of band representatives in Chicago for final preparation of the Global Council. The Annual Appeal taskforce begins work on design and materials for the 81-82 campaign. The 1980 Global Programme Report goes to print this week. Area Buenos Aires reports that US\$24,366 were raised last year, with 28 individual pledges contributing \$2142. Inking six additional computer terminals catalyzes training, documentation and effective data access in Chicago. The key contradiction lies in the arena of a plateaued giving base.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports *IMAGE* number 3 reaches its final phases in being printed and available by August 2. June has produced a large number of House PSU's as well as opportunities for corporate reflection on the future. A documentation task force is in the process of putting all Regional Consult issues, mandates and strategic directions on the computer to enable having the written data manageable with speed. The Global Council of three-week length is designed to be a model for area and regional councils; the bookends of four days each include socio-spirit exercises, ten work session days, two days of priorship training, and a rhythm of casual and formal celebrations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the continuation of research systems during June to August as all efforts are put into keeping the whole Nexus House functioning and joining into the work of the Global Council.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the completion of Regional Consults across the globe signals the end of a quarter and produces many program possibilities already for Quarter I. Global Operations Chicago prepares for Global Council by pulling together data, space and constructs. Brussels reports a breakthrough in turning Consult proposals into advantages with the I.E.R.R. PSU and company consultancy proposals in U.K. The key contradiction lies in the arena of transiting from the program of Quarter IV to Quarter I without losing input critical to program of next three months.

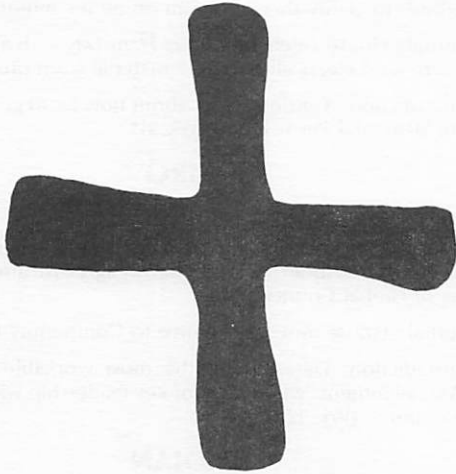
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Breakthroughs focus on savings in air travel which have amounted to over \$250,000 in Chicago in past year with similar reports coming from around the band. GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports \$7 million raised this past year: \$5 million in deposited monies and \$2 million in contracts for the future. The reports centers on emphasis of the five constituencies — individuals, corporations, religious bodies, foundations and agencies, and program income — as focus for our global development strategy. North American annual appeal and SEAPAC corporation work reflected breakthroughs for global development in the past year. Exchange and implementation of the Band strategies for all areas of the globe emerge as a contradiction for this Global Council.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports *IMAGE* number 3 reaches its final phases in being printed and available by August 2. June produced a large number of House PSU's as well as opportunities for corporate reflection on the future. A documentation task force is in the process of putting all Regional Consult issues, mandates and strategic directions on the computer to enable having the written data manageable with speed. The Global Council of three-week length is designed to be a model for area and regional councils; the bookends of four days each include socio-spirit exercises, ten work session days, two days of priorship training, and a rhythm of casual and formal celebrations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the continuation of research systems during June to August as all efforts are put into keeping the whole Nexus House functioning and joining into the work of the Global Council.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports support for the Global Council. Innovative support structures for the Council include a Daily Global Voice, computerized data interchange and intensified model exchange. The 1981-82 program activity estimates include 2056 programs and 73 Regional Consults involving 126,613 people. The key contradiction lies in the arena of prioritizing the immediate demands out of long range interchange operating modes.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports from Brussels that 16 people from Europe board planes for Global Council in one week. Supporting the Global Council is key focus with activities ranging from check cashing and stipend/house check conversations to serving 600 people three times a day, continuing inkind victories for food, supplies and surprises, and printing back up materials, reports, working materials and symbolic items. On-going-work includes finance reports and trainging new people to do Institute financial work. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the tension of Council participation and maintaining on-going work.
