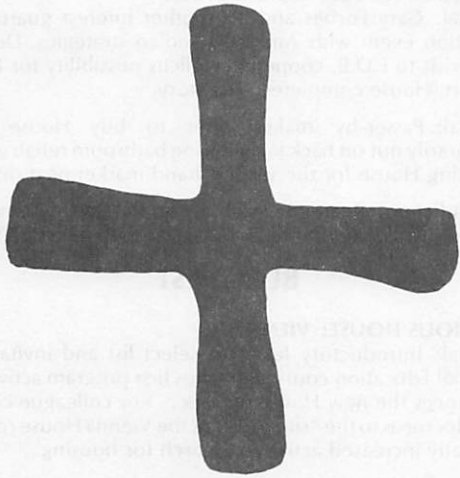


THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

QUARTER II WEEK FIVE

October 26-November 1, 1981



MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Another week of high activity happens as Barbara, Lucy, Russell and a young Spanish woman volunteer prepare for six-week stay in northern Portugal to prepare HDZ and an HDTI in January. Brussels and Berlin team arrive to kick off two-week LENS marketing in Madrid. Volunteer sheet in five languages is mailed to all European Houses along with posters on Portugal for volunteers to Portuguese HDZ. Follow-up manoeuvres meeting is held in Bocquillas (Avila).

Internal: House is continually filled to over-flowing with send out of Connie to Brussels, Norton family spending five days, LENS marketing team arriving, open house party celebrating arrival of Erik Soderland and with a constant flow in and out of Day I volunteers.

Contradiction: Finding ways to handle all requests in six regions while everyone is already working over-time in HDZ and Madrid Region. (Wk. 3)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Major corporation sets LENS seminar for late November, potentially launching LENS track record in Europe. Audit prep is completed in record two and half days. Youth-oriented radio station begins referring inquiries for overseas voluntary work to ICA which triples weekly rate of requests for volunteer programme information.

Internal: Creation of real guest room out of what had been large bath and toilet room is accomplished around visits of Ken and Pat Gilbert family, the Nexus trek, Rod Hall (Pace resident on way to intern in Nigeria) and Dale Hall (Pace resident now serving in U.S. army in Glasgow).

Contradiction: Creating sense of chastity in midst of multiple and compelling demands which seem to scatter focus daily. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Liza Todd accompanies circuit team to Gordonstoun Public School, one of oldest and most exclusive in U.K., and sets up showing of global film. Team sets up other events and renews many contacts. At same time, Anne Marie Murphy spends half-term in Manchester and visits colleagues.

Internal: Sylvia Francis secures temporary typing job and is invited for three job interviews.

Contradiction: Clarifying Glasgow Region objectives in order to inform everyone about Colloquy. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Volunteers respond to Volunteer Service Programme publicity from Manchester, Bristol and Cardiff. Roman Catholic Canon at cathedral on committee for Third World Development opens door for I.E.R.D. links to Cardiff parishes. Phizer Company visit in Madrid with Frank Soderlind secures positive referral for Dublin LENS possibility.

Internal: Three generations of Gilbert family spend Week II here at home farm while three generations of Norton family spend week in Madrid.

Contradiction: Continuing to do implementaries while long-term strategy seems unclear. (Wk. 4)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Regional team becomes visible as House and Development visit nine colleagues. Local banker agrees to be on ICA board. House hears reflection on rural France based on forum and circuit experiences and *The New France* by John Ardagh (1977).

Internal: On Monday night from six to midnight, all hands transform offices and bathrooms to make ready for colleagues and landlords.

Contradiction: Seeing how the parts of the five priorities of next two weeks can be arranged to work for each other. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Centurms continue presence in six locations and experience getting concrete thrusts going on a number of fronts.

Internal: Presence and then send out of Oyler family to Kenya occasions celebration of power of Global Order to respond to situations.

Contradiction: Creating eventfulness that declares corporate thrust of Nexus in continent and signals end of "positioning" phase. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Fulfillment is here and now — second Women and Work Seminar (8 to 60) is held; CIDA proposal for researching Women in Development is sent in; and Youth Forum in neighborhood community results in two more forum dates set. English teachers guild establishes House as self-supporting; circuit to Charleroi Metro sets up another forum for November; and Newsletter goes out in three languages. Working with United Way: Belgium exposes staff to Christian national corporation leaders.

Internal: Long conversations on individual colleague spirit care dominate internal life.

Contradiction: Discerning, amidst the ten arenas of mission, what *The* victory of this quarter is. (Wk. 3)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Local people do Ludwigshafen Symposium set-up and leadership — the first step in setting up a city-wide coalition.

Internal: Victories include printing quarter manoeuvres and internal life guide and celebrating Dara Stringham's birthday.

Contradiction: Guarding time for critical strategic action that will create a new regional team while carrying out necessary

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Four years of long waiting results in the House receiving *The ICA: Europe* brochure in local languages. Search for the Formation Colloquy facility ends with regional colleague/volunteer finding a place in Amsterdam. Centrum and regional team begin training by preparing for first Week II of the Colloquy and planning future events.

Internal: Self-support strategy continues with corporation visits, colleague enlistment and visa victory for newest House member. Research dynamic becomes a lively art as House searches "library" for quotable statements to use in *The Journal*.

Contradiction: Moving into final countdown for the Formation Colloquy with no clear picture of the entire event. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Visits to three structures which may be the focus of Berlin program this year highlight development week.

Internal: House sends Shirley to Spain for LENS push and receives Steve Karnadi from Jakarta Region for a day's visit.

Contradiction: Creating some "gathered" dynamic in a team so scattered that local training is jeopardized. (Wk. 3)*

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: Completion of reorganization of Area filing systems speeds up information dissemination. Many visits made on religious orders by Development and seminar recruitment teams reveal continuing and increased interest in ICA methods. Youth task force meeting initiates a new thrust.

Internal: First youth cluster meeting and Maharashtra Phase III collegium highlights week, and lengthy corporate session comes up with great decor model for House and training centre. House hosts Julie Thonon, colleague from Switzerland.

Contradiction: Getting seminar recruitment past initial contact stage to securing solid decisions. (Wk. 3)*

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Gary Forbes and his mother interest guardians at formation event with American Indian strategies. Development visit to F.D.B. cooperative elicits possibility for I.E.R.D. support. House completes Area story.

Internal: Passer-by makes offer to buy House toilet, temporarily out on back lawn during bathroom rehab week — mistaking House for the second-hand market next door!

Contradiction: Recreating stability on thin ice of permeation and visas while continuing to build programme base. (Wk. 3)*

BUDAPEST**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Introductory letter to select list and invitation to Imaginal Education course launches first program activity that announces the new House presence. Key colleague contexts local doctor as to the "situation" of the Vienna House resulting in greatly increased activity in search for housing.

Internal: Visit to 1400-room summer palace of the Hapsburgs recalls past and continuing significance of the symbolic and Austria's role among the nations of the world.

Contradiction: Finding facility that lends itself to being demonstration of futuric social style within a price range that is manageable. (Wk. 4)*

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA**

External: Team completes Sheik Ali water system and moves to desert town of Sanour. Abu Salah leadership request water system installation, giving possibility for expansion to another cluster.

Internal: House celebrates completion of Quarter I timeline with a party and commissioning of new teams.

Contradiction: Moving on quarter's contradiction of regional authorization when two of three Minia Region governors are changed as part of new national reforms. (Wk. 13)

ABIDJAN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Brobo circuit team initiates training center dynamic in the Village Development Cluster (V.D.C.), while Abidjan team discovers untapped, high-demand market for short-term English language programmes.

Internal: After one year wait, the telephone company starts to plant the poles and lay the line to the House.

Contradiction: Implementing actions that push the V.D.C.'s (Village Development Cluster) toward radically new modes of development without gimmickery and without simplistic, out-moded results. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Week's focus on development yields N 1,000 (U.S. \$1,500) from large Lagos Corporation. LENS is set up with a community organization for the end of October. New team members visit key sponsors, Bishop Kale and Archdeacon J.O.A. Ajayi, in Ijebu-Ode in Ogun State.

Internal: House and team experience day of discontinuity as Nigeria celebrates 21 years of Independence and the second anniversary of the second Federal Republic. Owolola is sent out for five days to work on marriage plans with extended family.

Contradiction: Uncertainty about model for HDTs recruitment and contacts to set up forums for authentic field training experience makes clear the need to formulate the urgent story that frees movement on all fronts. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Diamond of Zambia Assembly decides on five key-stones for this quarter. Coca Cola Zambia delivers Diamond of Zambia signboards for cluster villages and approves big two-sided hoarding at Great North Road for Kapini. Regional programme extension takes place with a trek to the Copperbelt and "yeses" for LENS in October and November.

Internal: House sends out five N.R.D.C. students with dinner party after their eight-week stay in Kapini and welcomes the Bleadon-Castro family.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension of time and troops with three areal strategies. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: East African Industries trains health team in nutrition in preparation for training health caretakers in three sub-locations. Development team brings in 63,000/ Kenyan shillings (US\$6,300) of which 43,000/ is for Ford Foundation case study of Muputi Location Cluster. In-kind blitz nets 20% of eighth HDTI budget, including cement floors for training center and 30 meters of cloth for New Village Movement banners.

Internal: Globe descends upon House as Robert Rafos returns from London LENS manoeuvre, Vinod Taksande arrives from Maliwada, Ike Powell visits from Area Cario, Clark and April Johnson sojourn from Area San Francisco, and Oylers arrive for new assignment to Area Nairobi. Rafos family receives new assignment as Area Priors of Lagos.

Contradiction: Developing system planning that enables all to move in midst of chaotic program schedule. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: Leaders' meetings set up village meetings for pre-consult phase of Hamisi A Cluster Consult. Circuit teams visit Kituni and Kusa HDP's. Development circuit inkindings over 4,000/ worth of goods, with wood for the signs for the next 12 villages as the biggest victory.

Internal: House hosts first section meeting of quarter with 40 people present.

Contradiction: Involving the whole village, including the men, in the development process. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Newly-opened clinic has another record-breaking attendance of over 300 people for the second week. District Commissioner says "yes" to beginning the Muthithi Location Cluster Project, and village surveys begin in Giathaini Sub-Location.

Internal: Mugunaini House becomes a Section House with the arrival of eight new people and two days of inkinding utensils which net 500/- worth of implements and supplies.

Contradiction: Getting new troops on the road to do cluster preparation with the momentum required. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: Site selection is finalized for new HDP in Kitui District. Quarter's first cluster circuits in Muputi result in quarter plans created by 18 of the villages. Soil conservation campaign continues with 500 terraces (17,200 meters) in past month. Section circuits are completed to four villages and new sub-location leaders meeting is held to launch Location Cluster in Chongi Location, Kilifi District, Coast Province.

Internal: Quarter circuit training for Muputi team is completed and Project Directors Meeting is held for section one in Kamweleni and one in Vwevvesii for coast projects.

Contradiction: Creating story that combines village and government priorities so that the operation of projects can be viewed as common thrust, not over against each other. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Nexus travels to Chikhale for great *shramadam* (workday) to prepare for next week's *Bhoomi Pujan* (ground-breaking ceremony) for new training centre. Cluster Actuation PSU includes three areas and two centrums. Imaginal Education Pedagogy includes 16 from Nexus as Course Mode is initiated for the year and three demonstration courses are prepared for next three weeks.

Internal: *Dessera* celebration makes Roundtable a fine event with special food and story of the celebration. Phase I begins curriculum of making toys, starting with two big beautiful wooden fire engines.

Contradiction: Determining appropriate style of the centrums necessary in the regions. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Professor Fabian Udekwu remarks on the dramatic permanent "changes" he witnessed in Sikror and helps new village doctor with a diagnosis. Brian Robins (GOC) and Brian Stanfield (GRC) arrive from Nexus to participate in HDZ PSU.

Internal: House participates in *Dashera* Festival as it becomes clear Delhi is going to close down for three days.

Contradiction: Revving up for one more planning session on the HDZ when it is four months since we visited the turf. (Wk. 2)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Circuit to Hyderabad City rediscovers old colleagues Mr. Barman and Mr. Chalappa, both in influential positions in society, who get behind house hunting campaign. Circuit to Bangalore-Madras encounters delays, derailments, *Desara* holidays and the heat of Madras, but gets initial research work done.

Internal: Quarter-long full-day detailed E.G. curriculum is planned out and initiated, providing temporary school for school-age E.G. for Quarter II. Kitchen and storeroom are cleaned and office space is completely reorganized.

Contradiction: Locating key catalytic stories and structures through which to do the "Deep South" — Area Madras. (Wk. 2)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Visit to key bustee (city neighbourhood) committee and participation in seminar on health initiate follow-up to Human Development course. Fifteen letters are sent to set up Patna and Ranchi circuits. Comprehensive mailing list is created and typed with 200 names in preparation for first mailing of year.

Internal: Additional new room for House is made ready and available as E.G. curriculum begins with House children and three more from neighbourhood. Conversations with landlord discuss building of new collegium room on disused plot. House is excited as four-hour once-a-week English lessons begin.

Contradiction: Discerning the key people to build momentum in city programme arenas in midst of *Puja* holiday. (Wk. 1)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: House hits the road looking for new housing and beginning first self-support consultancy. Half of the Nexus is on circuits in five regions.

Internal: Quarter II internal life models are in place, and House hunting results in near decision to move.

Contradiction: Creating symbolic life that weaves together internal and external into one missional thrust. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: *Hari Raya Haji* (celebration of the Return from Mecca) visit to Sungai Lui begins formation of Town Meeting team for upcoming circuit in Kuala Pilah. Sewing factory manager agrees to work release for Town Meeting leaders. Newly printed translated CEM document, courtesy of Bank Bumiputra, is distributed to village leadership.

Internal: New regional facility is acquired in the city of Kuala Lumpur which fulfills all necessary requirements for initiating the region's vision of a sojourn program.

Contradiction: Forming regional Town Meeting team in a hurry. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Imaginal Education course with 24 preschool teachers from 11 villages is signal event of Women's Advancement Program — and four new preschools are organized. Date is confirmed for second Imaginal Education course — with Community Education Department for District field workers. Provincial Health Department agrees to make *Kecamatan* (district) Tanjung Pura their demonstration.

Internal: PSU with Operations Centrum on District Demonstration Design and HDZ excites all in getting story told of 100 human settlements on the move.

Contradiction: Deciding strategic House location to serve metro and region while fully emersed in district demonstration. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Global mandate to continue P.T.P. permeation probe is dramatically fulfilled as key guardian offers opportunities to do LENS with sugar plantation in previously dormant region of Surabaya and an English-teaching programme for P.T.P. staff in Yogyakarta is confirmed. Meetings are held with contact at key Chinese foundation to battleplan presentation of \$140,000 proposal. LENS openings pop up all over in the Development calls — teamwork and motivation are the key selling points.

Internal: Three days after open House invitations are mailed, replies begin coming in. Evening metro visits begin, and young student met in the park shows up as enthusiastic Day 1 volunteer and likely participant in sojourn programme.

Contradiction: Insuring participation of key Indonesian colleagues which allows major year-launching tactics to be movemental formation happenings. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Rice Research Institute for East Indonesia (LPPM) visits two cluster villages and plans with farmers for brand new (to Indonesia) rice demo for salty low land. Rice expert explains that before the Bontoa HDP, the LPPM had never worked directly with local farmers. The farmers of last year's double rice crop demonstration are planning, inviting and recruiting for cluster-wide planning for massive double rice program in the cluster this year. They push Agriculture Department to use vision, contradiction, etc. methods, not just speeches.

Internal: Three weddings, a religious fiesta for a new house (one of five being built this month) keep social calendar full. Raharjo's 30th birthday and writing of a *gogaranca* (double rice crop) song enhance week.

Contradiction: Preparing for farmers module in the district while enabling the cluster (sub-district) to shine before Area Council. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Tokyo Development circuit deposits almost one million yen while Development and Operations team-up in Taiwan for week of Development and LENS marketing. Nexus launches "Local Man Management Seminar" with neighbourhood businessmen. Busy week holds I.E.R.D. visit set-up and preparation for hosting North Dakota Agricultural Tour coming out of China.

Internal: Self-supporting manoeuvre of dubbing American voice on T.V. series nets HK \$10,000 for Nam Wai and Nexus. House enjoys participation in Asia Arts Festival in Victoria Park.

Contradiction: Releasing creative energies toward human systems in midst of experiencing confusion and frustration in local management systems and self-support manoeuvre. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Programs focus on training as House is asked to design Town Meeting training for Hong Kong corporation managers who have previously participated in a company LENS and to train a social service agency in methods. House trains and engages three Chinese women who volunteer to spend their one day off working in Nam Wai.

Internal: Self-support gets boost as Jack "J.R." Ballard takes part-time job dubbing English dialogue for a Chinese soap opera, and Louise increases English language classes to 12 a week for 20 students.

Contradiction: Finding indicative need that will engage regional task force and sojourners in formation of a regional demonstration. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: In preparation for upcoming development and LENS trek, House sets up 40 development and 10 LENS appointments. New 1980-81 Human Development Program Report is printed in time for trek along with Summer Youth Program Report done by Chinese staff.

Internal: J.W.M. paper "The Two Faces of the Movement" impacts both Chinese and Western staff as House begins quarter of research into liturgy context.

Contradiction: Maintaining an institutional face in the world which is always in tension with unsynonomous dynamic of a movement. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: One week training seminar is held in Sudtonggan for World Bank/Ministry of Agriculture-sponsored rural development staff from Iloilo Province. Philcom (RCA) requests follow-up departmental LENS after company successfully attains the vision of last year's LENS, "To become #1 in the Philippines". Two-week development trek makes 50 calls and raises \$4,000 in hand. Regional team meets for ICA board meeting. Joe Nagy, visiting from Hong Kong House, completes a project evaluation for AID.

Internal: House welcomes Nancy Griffin, Wendy Scott and Peggy Johnson on way to Mactan-24, and Ken Ellison, traveling with PIP president, visits Manila and Cebu. *New Rules* and *The Old Neighborhood* help to image the emerging 'new'. Facility search continues in Makati and near the airport.

Contradiction: Orchestrating 24 manoeuvres that will turn all the heads of all the sectors. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Sewing factory delivers 100 dusters and 113 electric fan covers to Gaisano. Quarter weighing report is completed.

Internal: House workday applies fertilizer to Bagrass trees.

Contradiction: Getting all the preschool gardens "flowering". (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: During a four-day circuit to Niigata Prefecture on the Japan Sea side, six towns and "the frame" are visited. Team holds the first of 12 Training Modules at Seibu Community College.

Internal: New Sunday Celebration gains a place in significatng the events of the House with six guests attending, including Paul Maruyama who reports on his vist to Kemper.

Contradiction: Giving each action the quality demanded by the Japanese while pursuing comprehensive and intensive strategies. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: LENS maneuver advances as mailing goes out, Mr. Kim Tae Dong agrees to chair LENS team and two guardians agree to be LENS faculty. Shell guardian begins series of visits to the cluster projects by guardians.

Internal: Regional team celebrates completed two-week RS-I pedagogy and Week II Imaginal Education focused on health, preschools, women and guardians, and sends out Lee Jung Min from Kwanyung II Ri to global assignment.

Contradiction: Translating global vision and programs through screen of local culture and language. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: After hearing Miss Han's report on Kuh Du E Ri's small beginning in cattle raising and how they handled their problems, Cluster Core leaders decide to use existing village money to begin, facing the reality that waiting for outside funds accomplishes nothing. Ho Jeong 1 Ri is first to have all-village meeting to decide and make concrete plans. Village chief says, "This is the first time to have this kind of corporate income raising project in our history (some 400 years)".

Internal: House prepares for winter by building temporary walls in village hall and celebrates "cozy" room with Korean poetry writing on "The Way" in Roundtable.

Contradiction: Finding the way to keep moving strongly in this cluster while taking initial steps in a new province. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: LENS mailing goes out to 257 companies and individuals; 18 LENS calls are completed; nine villages in Saga Prefecture receive letters; and Chamber of Commerce at Kita Kyushu gives team their membership book for all their area and says, "Whoever you contact, we will contact." All this is powerful affirmation of ICA work. Invitation is received to attend Western Japan Industrial Club Management Lecture where ICA will hand out 80 packets of materials. Global Language School brochure is printed with help of five volunteers, and two universities are invited to participate in student module training event.

Internal: Activity flourishes as Ikuko Furikawa, training volunteer, celebrates birthday at Sherene's with a big party; Joyce gets two more teaching jobs and serves as hostess for two days at fish-fair selling Canadian fish paste; Jean serves on a panel for 60 English teachers, and Adia has Sport's Day at School.

Contradiction: Facing concretely and personally the *Third Wave* reality of INTERCHANGE in the tasks during the coming weeks. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: First Advisor's Meeting with nine in attendance adds momentum to recruiting the upcoming JITA LENS, November 10-11. Another Advisor's Meeting is scheduled for the close of the JITA LENS as a means for evaluation with Mr. Kobori, a strong colleague, leading the meeting. Keizo Tajima, a sojourner, experiences his first circuit to the city Foreign Office and the Kansai Economic Federation, and agrees to participate in the Wazuka Town Meeting as a translator.

Internal: House has several occasions for celebration as two sojourners have birthdays complete with home-baked cake and ice cream, and Rebecca Boone marks the completion of her Intern Year with colleagues and a bottle of white wine.

Contradiction: Maintaining a balance between Training Center care activities with self-support and missional demands. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Sapporo LENS Symposium is shifted to March after consultation with advisors in order to maintain ICA's long-term relationships with many companies and to nurture others.

Internal: New automatic washing machine, large American-model refrigerator, and new time schedule allow more staff meeting time and discontinuity. House celebrates Mariko Kasai's birthday at cake and wine party with colleagues.

Internal: Week II Imaginal Education course is taken seriously by Sydney House — everyone has chance to do a conversation, lecture or workshop — and it's followed by two birthday celebrations, Addie Lyman and Lisepa Telekau.

Contradiction: Turning 29 tentative yeses into registrations while setting up the next avalanche. (Wk. 3)*

Jude Samson, UCC of the Marshall Islands, and Fred Naroun, KITCO Manager, reveal appreciative and supportive friends, while Attorney General enables possibility of visas without tedious process of securing work permits.

Internal: Dick and Nan Engstrom, Marshall Islands Theological School, drop by and are impressed by transformation of space, and they expectantly await resumption of Roundtable and Common Meal dynamics. House hosts Headstart nurse as first formal dinner guest, duly registered in House guest book.

Contradiction: Creating unified image of House as both functional ICA consultants' residence and visible exemplary religious house. (Wk. 1)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: First program set for new year is LENS in Sanger, California, scheduled for November 11-13, sponsored by the City Council and Chamber of Commerce. First newsletter is made print-ready to launch Regional Communications System.

Internal: House life is marked by completion of Internal Life Guide and creation of E.G. curriculum emphasizing wonder of life, as demonstrated by transformation of E.G. space with two different colors of bright paint.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on setting up program reveals far out-stripped logistical support base. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Internal: Three Pittsburgh Metro colleagues carry lead roles in Pittsburgh Roundtable.

Contradiction: Seeing the silver thread that runs through patches of regional activities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Meetings and activities thrive in six metros: Binghamton metro prepares Community Net-work Newsletter for mailing and Buffalo metro plans a three-meeting series over the next six weeks to accelerate activity there. Rochester metro establishes weekly meetings and in Albany metro Troy Downtown clergy group sets date for a community forum.

Contradiction: Creating Regional Team consensus with a calender that allows only infrequent get-togethers. (Wk. 4)*

External: Excited and enthusiastic Regional Team hosts and participates in Area Self-Support PSU, Area Formation Colloquy PSU, and Area Guardian Regulatory all during Week II of Week 2. Staff of Cape Human Resources expresses disbelief that "it's 4 P.M." after day-long workshop of time-lining tactics to revitalize the image of their agency, and planning for next steps in working in local communities. Rev. Roger Grussing expresses concern about human suffering in Harrisburg Metro and suggests that the ICA may be the ones needed to respond to this situation.

Internal: Regional Team receives mailing which includes letter describing Regional Team dynamic, Regional Team Directory, and invitation (with explanation) to participate in global prayers and Area Fast and Feast.

Contradiction: Hosting Pilgrimage of Hope in such a way that it will bring honor to the Global Order. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Nineteen adults attend Leadership Training Workshop for Voluntary Organizations planned and led by Baltimore cadre. Region is represented at Area Guardian meeting by six participants. Southern Virginia circuit to three metros continues to build strong-hold of Regional Team. Permeation task force spends day at colleague's office creating proposal for computer system related enterprise.

Internal: Office systems in Washington and Richmond are established in mode which meets missional demand.

Contradiction: Orchestrating accelerated region-wide eventfulness. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

Internal: Thanksgiving, an area event, and includes reporting followed by traditional feast. Roundtable as a reflective time refreshes all.

Contradiction: Building steps into over-all plan that implement the long-range strategy. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House submits proposal for facility in Mississauga. The Hudson Bay Mining and Smelting Co. Ltd. gives \$2,000. Development team sets the tracking system in place.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with corporate prayer writing and good food.

Contradiction: Anticipating and planning next steps for programmatic thrust instead of just waiting for proposal responses. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Circuit to Kingston metro sets up ECF and film show raises possibility of RS-I. Colloquy moves forward with site located and brochure. Mid-quarter planning reveals four thrusts for the Quarter.

Internal: Roundtable with colleagues is exciting event with revealing conversation on the transestablishment.

Contradiction: Nailing down many possibilities to calender dates for programs. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

Contradiction: Getting commitments for program and self-support in order to place strategic anchors for year. (Wk. 1)

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY**

External: During LENS set-up presentation to Xerox and Richard Merrill, both express need for planning and consensus methods, leaving open invitations to continue talking about possibility of two LENS for Quarter III and each requests a LENS letter to initiate the set-up process.

Internal: Collegium on Regional rationale generates expectation and anticipations on how to do Regional coverage through training and formation of Regional Teams with the participation of all.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensive missional engagement, while consensing on the internal House issues and on necessary P.R. materials. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: Twenty-nine farmers travel together to Santiago Sacatepequez and are deeply impacted by cooperative accomplishments of agricultural program. Wicker Industry returns loan of \$50.00 through sale of two easy chairs. Persistent efforts at refinements and accommodations to needs are crowned by resounding YES to Water Committee and its management plan from community assembly, attended by over 150 adults (and innumerable youngsters).

Internal: Another Friday Roundtable event (seventh in a row) with festive dinner and reading from *The Ancient of Days* is appreciated by twelve guests from community leadership core.

Contradiction: Facing severely limited crop marketing possibilities for agricultural program. (Wk. 7)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: House and Social Development Commission (SDC) staff visit 14 villages setting up seven mini-consults and seven village leaders' meetings to launch the St. Thomas Pilot Village Cluster Project around Woburn Lawn. ICA and SDC hold Community Forum in Race Course and Youth Forum for all youth clubs in Manchester Parish. ICA sets up LENS follow-up events with the National Commercial Bank (one-day seminar) and St. Jude Church (weekend retreat).

The visit of the Lindsey's, with a focus on I.E.R.D. set-up, elicits excitement and high interest from many people in SEAPAC. The key contradiction lies in the arena of giving form to the new role of development on the other side of Annual Appeal and in the midst of intensifying program acceleration.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that working on three new courses at once opens up the possibility of spinning many plates at once—DLL, Academy Cabaret recovers and advances that dramatic act as an evangelism tool. Redoing our images of time by doing week-end PSU's and launch from course building—collegium is central to the festival in a new way. The key contradiction lies in the arena of so many plates spinning no one image conveys our commonality in the missional task.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Hong Kong trek to Taiwan starts with two LENS set for November and March. A North American Information System PSU with 35 participants gave form to the responsible use of the computer technology for the regions and the Bands, for both self-support and information processing functions. The bottom dropped out at the I.S. PSU as the group responded to conversations relating technology, ethics, and vocation, resulting in the discovery that the PSU was a line prototype for vocational retreats for the emerging new guilds. The key contradiction lies in the arena of still staging the break-through in imagination necessary to build momentum towards the January America's challenge marketing maneuvers.

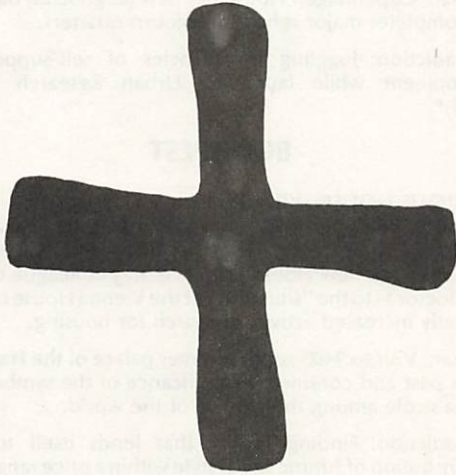
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: A voluntary agency dealing with unemployment says Yes to LENS. A materials writing task force is set up including managers who participated in LENS in Egypt, now located in London. Jean and Gill Wright from The Isle of Dogs bring Cornish pasties to session on ICA public image held with local social workers and volunteers.

Internal: House sends out Area representatives to the Schrijnen/Mead wedding in Brussels and Bill to LENS manoeuvre in Madrid, joyfully receives Leonard Sizer, hosts Professor and Mrs. Udekwu and Lis Banks, and receives sojourner prior to volunteering in India, finding time to celebrate Pieter Heylens' 8th birthday in playful style.

Contradiction: Allowing all to grasp internal roles sufficiently well to release full focus on missional task forces. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House completes first circuit this year to north Scotland with colleagues responding to the possibilities of participation. Great interest is shown in Volunteer Service Programme and LENS.

Internal: Presence and then send out of Oyler family to Kenya occasions celebration of power of Global Order to respond to situations.

Contradiction: Creating eventfulness that declares corporate thrust of Nexus in continent and signals end of "positioning" phase. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Metro colleague leads Women and Work Seminar #3 with 14 present. House member makes presentation of the United Fund of Belgium to eighty business leaders at American Embassy. Guest night attracts ten people, covering all segments of mission in Brussels.

External: Seminar participants are up to five and first scholarship money is in. House sends Tuecke family to I.C.R.A. Conference.

Internal: Vinod Parekh arrives enroute to I.C.R.A. Conference. House becomes victorious as final decor model is consensed on, and House celebrates Pat Tuecke's birthday.

Contradiction: Keeping all energy and labour focused on seminar preparation while moving on long-range thrusts. (Wk. 4)*

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: This is a week of sending out teams — permeation prob in Area London, framing and permeation probe in Region Copenhagen and Development in Area Paris.

Internal: Copenhagen House has new (as good as) bathroom and completes major rehab on sojourn quarters.

External: Team completes Sheik Ali water system and moves to desert town of Sanour. Abu Salah leadership request water system installation, giving possibility for expansion to another cluster.

Internal: House celebrates completion of Quarter I timeline with a party and commissioning of new teams.

Contradiction: Moving on quarter's contradiction of regional authorization when two of three Minia Region governors are changed as part of new national reforms. (Wk. 13)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: All five Kapini stakes participate in block making for Diamond of Zambia Clinic and produce 500 blocks. K.H.D.P. Disco hosts 100 youth to launch Youth Organization and collects K 49. Visit with District Governor firms up authorization for expansion work and begins registration process for Diamond of Zambia, while at the same time formation trek begins in Lusaka.

Internal: House receives Ian Kayo, Friday Chibale and Elias Mbewe as interns for one year. Twenty meters of blue cloth are inked to intentionalize Order symbol, and House task force meets for productive session, completing Internal Life Guide for Quarter II.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension among task, troops and programmes in forging one missional task. (Wk. 2)*

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Management Seminar held for District Chairwomen of *Maendeleo 4A Wanawake* (National Women's Group) solidifies relationship, includes women from five HDP's and provides opportunity for authorization with public and private sector. Muputi Operation Manual at printers will provide procedures and guidelines for other location cluster projects. The eighth session of HDTI opens with participants from the sub-locations and three new districts.

Internal: In the midst of total space transformation and newly created office spaces, Lloyd Edward Philbrook, son of Larry and Evelyn, arrives — 8 lbs. 6 oz.; and three youth, Walter Heiges, John Cock and John Worden, are sent to HDTI.

Contradiction: Developing support structure to anticipate and sustain field needs. (Wk. 3)*

Contradiction: Being with the villagers, seeing their victories, celebrating them and then creating the new myth. (Wk. 5)*

Cluster Actuation PSU includes three areas and two centurms. Imaginal Education Pedagogy includes 16 from :Nexus as Course Mode is initiated for the year and three demonstration courses are prepared for next three weeks.

Internal: *Dessera* celebration makes Roundtable a fine event with special food and story of the celebration. Phase I begins curriculum of making toys, starting with two big beautiful wooden fire engines.

Contradiction: Determining appropriate style of the centurms necessary in the regions. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Last week of quarter is filled full with three sites targeted in village as priorities for training centre location. Director of Textile Committee for Government of India moves to enable *Ambar Charkha* Product Marketing. Cluster Agriculture Guild meets to plan Cluster Co-operative market centre and crop and vegetable loan repayment scheme.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Week of circuits includes visits to three regions and five metros. Glasgow Muslim referrals to colleagues in Gulbarga (Bangalore Region) and Hyderabad reveal many new colleagues. Visit to Collector initiates countdown to Jogipet Circle December Village Leader's Institute.

Internal: Collegium on Jogipet Circle and Saturday workday on circuits enable valuable thinking and planning that help accelerate the external task.

Contradiction: Deciding to set programmatic events in the midst of the ambiguity of House location, funding and authorization. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

Sewing factory manager agrees to work release for Town Meeting leaders. Newly printed translated CEM document, courtesy of Bank Bumiputra, is distributed to village leadership.

Internal: New regional facility is acquired in the city of Kuala Lumpur which fulfills all necessary requirements for initiating the region's vision of a sojourn program.

Contradiction: Forming regional Town Meeting team in a hurry. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Getting clarity on US:AID money release while the villages are ready and moving. (Wk. 3)*

The Global Language School curriculum is prepared to use with PTP, the government plantation companies. With 28 calls during the development blitz, US \$200,000 is now working.

External: Tokyo Development circuit deposits almost one million yen while Development and Operations team-up in Taiwan for week of Development and LENS marketing. Nexus launches "Local Man Management Seminar" with neighbourhood businessmen. Busy week holds I.E.R.D. visit set-up and preparation for hosting North Dakota Agricultural Tour coming out of China.

Internal: Self-supporting manoeuvre of dubbing American voice on T.V. series nets HK \$10,000 for Nam Wai and Nexus. House enjoys participation in Asia Arts Festival in Victoria Park.

Contradiction: Releasing creative energies toward human systems in midst of experiencing confusion and frustration in local management systems and self-support manoeuvre. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Programs focus on training as House is asked to design Town Meeting training for Hong Kong corporation managers who have previously participated in a company LENS and to train a social service agency in methods. House trains and engages three Chinese women who volunteer to spend their one day off working in Nam Wai.

Internal: Self-support gets boost as Jack "J.R." Ballard takes part-time job dubbing English dialogue for a Chinese soap opera, and Louise increases English language classes to 12 a week for 20 students.

Contradiction: Finding indicative need that will engage regional task force and sojourners in formation of a regional demonstration. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Three corporations in Taipei set tentative dates for LENS.

Internal: ICA welcomes new Chinese staff member Lucas Hsiao.

Contradiction: Allowing openness to longer range implications of current work while maintaining intense concentration on quarter and weekly tasks. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: One week training seminar is held in Sudtonggan for World Bank/Ministry of Agriculture-sponsored rural development staff from Iloilo Province. Philcom (RCA) requests follow-up departmental LENS after company successfully attains the vision of last year's LENS. "To become #1 in the Philippines". Two-week development trek makes 50 calls and raises \$4,000 in hand. Regional team meets for ICA board meeting. Joe Nagy, visiting from Hong Kong House, completes a project evaluation for AID.

Southern Virginia circuit to three metros continues to build stronghold of regional team. Permeation task force spends day at colleague's office creating proposal for computer system related enterprise.

Internal: Office systems in Washington and Richmond are established in mode which meets missional demand.

Contradiction: Orchestrating accelerated region-wide eventfulness. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Conversations and meetings with staff and students from Boston College (Jesuit), Boston Theological Institute (nine-seminary consortium), Dartmouth, Harvard and Yale all point to growing consensus that opportunities for service are keystone to education and that the Institute has strong capability to enable this thrust. Student participation in Starks' workdays injects energy and style.

Internal: Presence of extended family enriches House life with visits from John and Elsa's parents and Pat Goad's sister providing many celebrative occasions.

External: Fifth consecutive Saturday October workday at the old Starks' Cornshop completes community room ceiling, finishes winterization of building's exterior, provides ductwork for cold air return for heat in woodshop and hosts insulation workshop for 16 participants on the Chintz Cottage. Starks hosts costumed "contradance" for surrounding communities and produces profit for "Little Peeps" nursery school. The Stark Enterprises Corporation hosts a meeting of the Board of Advisors of the Starks HDP. After more than two years the I.R.S. has finally granted the S.E.C. its not-for-profit status!

Internal: House hosts a Starks open house to greet visit by Area priors Tim and Kay Lush and relishes the opportunity to swap great stories.

Contradiction: Lining up and coordinating the various paths to victory on multiple fronts. (Wk. 5)*

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Leadership Forum at inner city housing project, Habitation Jeanne Mance, representing four sectors is stepping stone to setting up smaller forums in five residential blocks of the community.

Internal: Youth cluster meeting in Ottawa provides C.Y.F. training for "All Area" youth cluster.

Contradiction: Launching and maintaining a second front to insure that the battle stays comprehensive. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: House submits proposal for facility in Mississauga. The Hudson Bay Mining and Smelting Co. Ltd. gives \$2,000. Development team sets the tracking system in place.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with corporate prayer writing and good food.

Contradiction: Anticipating and planning next steps for programmatic thrust instead of just waiting for proposal responses. (Wk. 3)

Ted Farrar and Jane Warren arrive to complete three-days of Liwi and Ledc book work. Lorne firemen individually buy formal firemen's uniforms, then show films and demonstrate fire safety and equipment to Lorne and Nash Creek schools during Fire Prevention Week.

Internal: Collegiums on guardian journey and R.E.P. impact team in new way. House completes Quarter II plan with comprehensive circuit rationale in place.

Contradiction: Getting commitments for program and self-support in order to place strategic anchors for year. (Wk. 1)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY

External: A conversation with colleague Fr. Benjamin Bravo reveals the opportunity to permeate the *Comunidades de Base* Movement in Mexico. Angel and Lupita Gonzales and their family are the first guests to House Church in the region. Legalization questions are clarified with the *notaio*.

Internal: A visit to the convent of colleague Sr. Carmen Galvin results in a contribution of numerous household materials.

Contradiction: Maintaining overburdened support structures while vision rapidly becomes reality is like walking on a tightwire with combat boots. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Cluster Mini-Consults are held at Goat Ridge, Mt. Vernon, Albion Mtn., Epping Farm/Minto, Hagley Gap, Bethel Gap/Mango Row and Riverhead with 389 villagers participating. Team does cluster framing visits and briefings with Permanent Secretaries of Agriculture and Youth, Social Development Commission, Basic Services Project (UNICEF), Jamaica Agricultural Society, and the Custos of St. Thomas. Development brings in years' first cheque and inkind paint and lumber for the Cluster signs.

Internal: Jamaica celebrates National Hero's Day; House works through HDZ models with Research Centrum representative from Chicago and revised CIDA grant with Development Centrum representative.

Contradiction: Discerning pillars of a cluster while launching one in the midst of uncertainties of logistics and data. (Wk. 4)*

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Peruvian government secures a donation from the private sector to provide basic materials for demonstration electrification project in Azpitia. Regional team meets to project the project intensification and extension plan for the year. Teachers from Lima have first planning session with auxiliary and school director to project children's summer program.

Internal: Manuel Samayoa arrives just in time to participate in House Council that gives a new sense of direction for the auxiliary team.

Contradiction: Concretizing attendance and funding for the Training School in the midst of multiple fronts of activity. (Wk. 4)*

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Successful site visit is held with diplomatic wives from seven countries and the Dutch ambassador. First Caracas "Guild" meeting is held in the office of the president of Royal Bank of Venezuela, and a plan for the economic revitalization of the Barlovento Region is created. Cano Negro leadership meets to plan the community workday for the upcoming Training Module. Eighteen representatives from the cluster villages are registered for the Training Module.

Internal: Joint auxiliary and community workday digs drainage system, completes Training Center painting and resurrects the green Volkswagen after a seven month long period in the tomb. Roundtable is a spiritizing community event complete with poetry writing, singing and an exercise pulling Gandhi's life through the Vocational Journey Chart. External: Third-year report of Sol de Septiembre goes to printer. Invitations to Kelly *Despedida* are out by mail or hand delivered. Monthly income tax report is in before deadline.

Internal: As one team member is on road to recovery from influenza complication, another is felled by "Senor Grippe" (the flu).

Contradiction: Deciding which action (that removes the doubt) is THE key to the future. (Wk. 2)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Rio Bonito team meeting with six community people reflects on Kenya model adaptation for Rio Bonito clusters and works on gridding municipality to possible cluster areas. The House initiates development with visits to two key guardians resulting in at least two months funding. Arthur Anderson reviews first six months of 1981 books and pronounces them very good.

Internal: First Saturday Weekly Ritual using India ritual is launched, the second Roundtable with Brazil study is an interlude in the week, and new Portuguese language books bring structure to House's daily Portuguese classes.

Contradiction: Clarifying basic arenas of missional responsibility. (Wk. 3)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that Sir James and Lady Lindsay's trek causes global ripples as *Bhoomi Pujan* (ground breaking) ceremony initiates Chickale Training Center; Indian Industrialist, Maharashtra State Governor and IERD Committees visits deepen collegiality; appointments, events and speaking engagements open SEAPAC doors; and IERD report to Chicago Nexus elicits excitement over possibility of global event as IERD impacts all regions. Program explosion results in scheduled income from core curriculum, new courses, community and corporation LENS in North America; 50 working LENS are reported out of Kuala Lumpur; and Caterpillar LENS is set for early November. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining comprehensive push on long-term funding and program set-up while bringing in necessary cash flow.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that China research design work in Hong Kong is accelerated by hosting a North Dakota farmers marketing team on their return from China including Doug Drukenmiller and others from the Sioux tribe. Research talking papers on HDZ, Fasting, Training and Primal Community highlight interchange and study activity among all Nexus. Three Structural Revitalization labs — Rural Venture Inc., McDonald's Corporation, and Training, Inc. — meet together and delineate underlying commonality in the intent and dynamics of structural revitalization. The contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining perspective on the big picture when any task could consume one's whole life.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports from Chicago Nexus a great launching of the North American Phase I Trek with affirming events in Philadelphia and Boston. Development and Operations Centruns in Chicago share regional data in motivating meeting in front of Programme Calender. Hong Kong reports Operations and Development mounting joint manoeuver in Taipei with LENS as focus. Kuala Lumpor reports joint Operations, Development and Area task force working out Indonesia expansion plans for the year. Bombay reports a breakthrough in turning from a data collection system to a data distribution facilitation system. The key contradiction from Kaula Lumpor lies in the arena of webbing villages and city activities into one cohesive thrust.

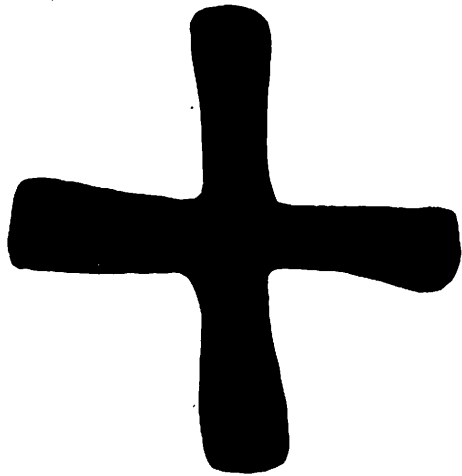
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

The fourth *IMAGE* is at the printers. Global use of computers is shortening accounting time, and launching Management Module with local business gives preview of practical service that is also self-support in Hong Kong. The key contradiction lies in the arena of smoothing out rough edges of management systems, including the preparation for people to play any role, to enable responsiveness to extraordinary demands.

Five teams from House, including E.G., do griding blitz of the local borough with population of 229,000. Godfrey Mweria, a Nigerian Ph. D. candidate, attends the first Volunteers Orientation Weekend of the Bristol Region. A voluntary agency requests LENS methods for their annual planning meeting.

Internal: Flow of sojourners and visitors to the House continues and Leonard is sent to Cardiff House to document Welsh Town Meeting.

Contradiction: Objectifying sojourner training models in midst of many tasks. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

Contradiction: Revving up the Region with circuits, events and development. (Wk. 5)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Beverly Parker of Paris and Tim Casswell of Brussels team up for visit to Lille Metro, visiting an office of the Fourth World Movement and a committee that coordinates developed-world efforts in the Third World. Paris supports global LENS effort and gets ready for the same in Paris by sending Kate Ward to Madrid LENS marketing and Desmond Avery to Zambia LENS facilitating.

Internal: Sister Yvonne Guenic comes for three days and with Board President Gerald Nani writes newsletter and volunteer flier.

Contradiction: Perceiving and using undiscerned time and resources to get newsletter into colleagues' hands. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Centurms continue presence in six locations and experience getting concrete thrusts going on a number of fronts.

Internal: Presence and then send out of Oyler family to Kenya occasions celebration of power of Global Order to respond to situations.

* NOTE: The * indicates the first printing of a new report.

Contradiction: Creating eventfulness that declares corporate thrust of Nexus in continent and signals end of "positioning" phase. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Team circuits to Lille with Paris House. Fourteen members of 23-year old *Community La Poudriere* visit House to share journey of secular religious. Women and Work Session #4 has 12 present, and Flemish Talk Cafe in Zellik sets forum date. Many work hours are spent with United Fund to permeate Brussels private sector, and RS-I publicity is up to launch Formation Colloquy.

Internal: Appetite for moving out of Nexus is whetted by visit to nunnery vacant for four years. Marian Hull, Rose Casewell's mother, provides delightful addition to House for a week. Herman and Lieve Meylens come to dinner on the way back to London, and House discovers that there is life after THE Wedding.

Contradiction: Non-programmatic spirit themes suggesting burning bushes and the future now number thirteen and can't wait till the end of the quarter, but whence cometh the time or the method to see what's real? (Wk. 5)*

Contradiction: Prioritizing the too-many places to catalyze for the number of beings available. (Wk. 4)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: ICRA Conference opens up new avenues to European funding sources and Italian agencies, and a new friend at the FAO. Italian colleagues spend a day in the House phoning companies for inkind assistance for the Week 6 seminar.

Internal: The Balm family obtains legal residency.

Contradiction: Expanding the Religious Order strategy in relation to the training centre. (Wk. 5)*

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Visit to the head of United Kingdom Royal College of General Practitioners and a major contact for World Health Organization to U.K. opens 22 new doors across Europe.

Internal: One job for permeation is secured, and House is symbolically represented at school Halloween party.

Contradiction: Creating the winning images to launch the Catalytic Guild for January Symposium as a test run on Urban Strategy. (Wk. 5)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: House profits from hard work of the past when local colleague of long-standing demonstrates *Those Who Care* dynamic and takes time out of busy schedule to give most complete context to date on Vienna and Eur-Asian scene. The invitation to a local celebrative event that same evening gives an opportunity to meet people from various parts of continent Eur-Asia. Neuwaldegg Training Center schedules Community Renewal Through Social Methods Course (Global Community Forum) taught by ICA staff as part of their curriculum offering. First training session involving local leadership for Imaginal Education course is held.

Internal: Hannerl Golda returns "home" for a week in Vienna and gives invaluable assistance and encouragement to House on several strategic calls.

Contradiction: Building a model to deal with the tension between initiating a new House in a new location and at the same time developing significant program momentum. (Wk. 5)*

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Workdays in three villages on the same day swirl the possibility and excitement about cluster engagement. Guardian Fr. Bert Linders requests three projects, totalling over U.S. \$17,000, to raise money for.

Internal: Four Dutch colleagues visit for two days, and ninth graders spend week in Cairo.

Contradiction: Securing regional and national authorization to move into expansion when existing demonstrations do not seem to be seen by the authorities as crucial to the future of rural development. (Wk. 6)*

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: After a year's wait, the telephone is installed and working! (44-34-74). Member of Parliament and his wife come to dinner, and neighbors, a Jesuit community, invite House to lunch. House next door becomes vacant and is made available to ICA, providing crucially needed space — new ICA office and additional staff housing.

Internal: New inkind file cabinet signals creation of new office. New English teaching job for oil company provides income to pay major outstanding debts.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on staff and development expansion so that recent victorious leaps don't become comfortable plateaus. (Wk. 4)*

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Week's focus on development yields N 1,000 (U.S. \$1,500) from large Lagos Corporation. LENS is set up with a community organization for the end of October. New team members visit key sponsors, Bishop Kale and Archdeacon J.O.A. Ajayi, in Ijebu-Ode in Ogun State.

Internal: House and team experience day of discontinuity as Nigeria celebrates 21 years of Independence and the second anniversary of the second Federal Republic. Owolola is sent out for five days to work on marriage plans with extended family.

Contradiction: Uncertainty about model for HDTS recruitment and contacts to set up forums for authentic field training experience makes clear the need to formulate the urgent story that frees movement on all fronts. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: All five Kapini stakes participate in block making for Diamond of Zambia Clinic and produce 500 blocks. K.H.D.P. Disco hosts 100 youth to launch Youth Organization and collects K 49. Visit with District Governor firms up authorization for expansion work and begins registration process for Diamond of Zambia, while at the same time formation trek begins in Lusaka.

Internal: House receives Ian Kayo, Friday Chibale and Elias Mbewe as interns for one year. Twenty meters of blue cloth are inked to intentionalize Order symbol, and House task force meets for productive session, completing Internal Life Guide for Quarter II.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension among task, troops and programmes in forging one missional task. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Muputi Location reports holding 863 meetings during the month with 16,613 people attending and workdays with a total of 16,955 people participating. A case study worker, participating through Ford Foundation Grant, is very impressed with the villagers ability to tell the story during Muputi site visit.

Internal: Week of celebrative welcoming and sending forth is highlighted by reception in honor of the Philbrook and Were families and their new babies, Lloyd Edward Philbrook and Louise Were, by receiving and assigning Rod Hall from Delta Pace, and a 21-question celebrative conversation sending forth the Rafos family to Area Lagos.

Contradiction: Developing communication and interchange systems that maximize breakthroughs, new insights and morale in midst of diversified situations. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: Consult preparation for the *Hamisi 'A'* Sub-Location cluster project continues with six village meetings and sub-location leaders meeting. A bicycle is donated to the project — hopefully the first of many.

Internal: Internal life takes a back burner as all attention is focused on consult preparation and David Coffman is assigned to Zambia to do LENS.

Contradiction: Working through House's relationship to the Area and the location cluster. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Giathaini Sub-Location Cluster Consult is completed with average of 100-120 participants per day from 4 villages with over 200 villagers participating on the closing day. The visits of the District Community Development Officer and the District Adult Education Officer as chief guests of the

closing brings home to the sub-location that own on-behalf-of development is possible. Singing and dancing flow out from each village Commissioning.

Internal: House celebrates the completion of the Giathaini Sub-Location Cluster Consult with special meal of pouris, dhall, sweet budgia and beef stew prepared by K. K.Tupe. House meeting exudes a new declaration of corporateness.

Contradiction: Enabling effective internal House operation while being forced to focus heavily on everyday external tasks. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: New breakloose of method allows House to begin impact of Iveti Location as beginning of campaign to impact 200 (approximate) villages in Central Division around Muputi Location Cluster. Other three clusters in section C send six people for training and impact support.

Internal: House celebrates birth of Lloyd Edward Philbrook at Weekly Ritual.

Contradiction: Being with the villagers, seeing their victories, celebrating them and then creating the new myth. (Wk. 5)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Nexus travels to Chikhale for great *shramadam* (workday) to prepare for next week's *Bhoomi Pujan* (ground-breaking ceremony) for new training centre. Cluster Actuation PSU includes three areas and two centrums. Imaginal Education Pedagogy includes 16 from Nexus as Course Mode is initiated for the year and three demonstration courses are prepared for next three weeks.

Internal: *Dessera* celebration makes Roundtable a fine event with special food and story of the celebration. Phase I begins curriculum of making toys, starting with two big beautiful wooden fire engines.

Contradiction: Determining appropriate style of the centrums necessary in the regions. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Last week of quarter is filled full with three sites targeted in village as priorities for training centre location. Director of Textile Committee for Government of India moves to enable *Ambar Charkha* Product Marketing. Cluster Agriculture Guild meets to plan Cluster Co-operative market centre and crop and vegetable loan repayment scheme.

Internal: Week is highlighted by completion of Quarter II planning, surprise visit by Wa'u from Indonesia on way to Kenya, and new House decor. Chikhale Ashram also sends troops to participate in quarter planning at Maliwada and Vaviharsh Ashrams.

Contradiction: Creating ways to engage all of the people all of the time in stake and guild structures of the *cluster*, the dynamics of which have not yet come clear. (Wk 13)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: HDZ PSU with two Brians from Bombay sets plans for the quarter, and initial calls with four sectors show readiness for this step. Team visits Sri Krishna's Leper Colony and is impacted by a profound demonstration of self-conscious community in the midst of humanly impossible situation. Sikror team takes engineer to village to inspect the House electrical fittings which are ready for meter connections.

Internal: House hosts regional colleague at Roundtable, and celebrates Geeta Bhojar's 24th birthday.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between stirring up excitement about HDZ and treading carefully in preparation for the next 20 years. (Wk. 3)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: With the completion of Week 4 circuits to Warangal and Hyderabad, every House adult has now been on at least one area and/or regional circuit. Contradiction: Creating the common images of the rest of the quarter which allow centrums and nexus to move effectively as a whole. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

Contradiction: Finishing 1982-83 plan with diverse priorities and utilizing key wisdom of the House prior before he leaves for three weeks to be on staff of Global Language School. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Tokyo circuit nets LENS and Town Meeting sponsorship. Operations and Development visit Taiwan to do LENS marketing and set up first LENS for two weeks from now. Pat DeSpain, Aimee and Frank Hilliard, Bob McLaughlin and Doug Druckenmiller and are present for reception held for North Dakota farmers on their return from a three-week trip to China.

Internal: Hong Kong Nexus Fast Day is impacted by the North-South Conference. Self-support task force teaches English to refugees, and a Management module is held with a local businessman.

Contradiction: Creating follow-up module which brings to fruition the futuristic strategic forces out of the fantastic program events being held throughout the regions. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: North Dakota agricultural study group returns from trip to China and is hosted at ICA reception and film show at American Club with 41 present from all four sectors. Afterwards they report to House and area priors on their experience of China's development. A day-long tour of Hong Kong's five New Towns demonstrates the end of the rural in the New Territories.

Internal: House celebrates Frank Hillard's 50th birthday with champagne and gift of a brass statue of a Chinese general.

Contradiction: Having our planning catch up with our doing. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: New health clinic is built in San Miguel, while four days of training is going along for Purok Leaders in Sudtonggan.

Internal: House experiences two separate collegiums while E.G. space, new curriculum and structures are being emphasized. Houses' pathway made with rock chips is a real demonstration to the village and others outside Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Looking forward to the effectiveness of the two dynamics on the 24. (Wk. 4)

Contradiction: Making use of all available tools — global film, newsletters, LENS, Town Meeting, and Leadership modules, in order to accomplish the over-all strategies of the quarter. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPORO

External: Follow-up letters are sent to LENS grads. Rev. Hirata and Mrs. Ito are committed to participation in March LENS Symposium. Ten guests participate in Roundtable led entirely by Japanese staff and colleagues.

Internal: House celebrates Seiko Yaniganisawa's completion of one month in ICA. Takikawa English class is completed, freeing Saturdays for other work. House attends Halloween party at International School which is an uniquely American event attended by many Japanese people.

Contradiction: Balancing effort between doing many things quickly and a few things well. (Wk. 4)*

External: Fifth Citizens have surprise party at Corine's for Helen Eskridge's 55th birthday. Preschool presents testimony to the State to combat the cutbacks. The 5th City Community receives award for promotion of police and community relations. Follow-up of program marketing blitz results in continued momentum as four contracts for future programs are signed.

Internal: House celebrates birthdays, Jonathan Troxel's eleventh and Theo Mueller's 53rd, at close of day's construction of new dorms.

Follow-up meeting at New York Area Guardians produces first draft for accompanying Area priors trek.

Internal: Planning of new House facility construction is laid out for next seven months. House celebrates Halloween party in new facility while E.G. are "trick or treating" in New Brunswick.

Contradiction: Clarifying the one focus and the one great victory according to this quarter's priorities with House and Regional Team spread out for diverse activities. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Team names the \$60,000 assured in development plan for the year with year's program/development chart on the office wall.

Internal: Collegium on regional liturgical experiment and study of JWM's *Common Worship* provide context for wrestling with ordering the office and basement space abyss.

Contradiction: Daring to stand as the offence of Hope and woo others on to death ground. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Meetings and activities thrive in six metros — Binghamton Metro prepares Community Network Newsletter for mailing and Buffalo Metro plans three-meeting series over next six weeks to accelerate activity there. Regional Consult follow-up visits are still going on in Syracuse Metro and Poughkeepsie Metro is looking at set up of four Town Meetings as Regional Consult follow-up. Rochester Metro establishes weekly meetings and, in Albany Metro, Troy Downtown clergy group sets date for community forum.

Internal: Regional Team is "at home" all over region as one team helps celebrate Mel Knapp's birthday in Rochester.

Contradiction: Creating Regional Team consensus with a calender that allows only infrequent get-togethers. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Regional Team, including youth cluster, hosts pilgrims on Pilgrimage of Hope sponsored by Brothers of Taize with refreshments and slide showing with commentary about ICA work, escorts pilgrims to Grace Lutheran Church to learn about signs of hope in their community and have supper, then to the Cathedral of S.S. Peter and Paul for a service of prayer and song and inspiring words of Brother Roger, founder of Taize. Extended school strike allows youth to go on circuits highlighted by marketing of Methods Training Workshop and CYF.

Internal: Charles Peterson from Pilgrimage of Hope set-up team attends House Church.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of whole Regional Team so that it can do routine tasks of region after seven weeks of preparing for the hosting of Area events. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Nineteen adults attend Leadership Training Workshop for Voluntary Organizations, planned and led by Baltimore cadre. Region is represented at Area Guardian meeting by six participants. Southern Virginia circuit to three metros continues to build stronghold of regional team. Internal: Office systems in Washington and Richmond are established in mode which meets missional demand.

Contradiction: Orchestrating accelerated region-wide eventfulness. (Wk. 4)

Internal: House celebrates great week in spite of multiple car ailments by having dinner with Frank and Lyn Russell on day prior to workday and by seeing the play "The Unsinkable Molly Brown" following the workday.

Contradiction: Getting heat in the Cornshop Now. (Wk. 6)*

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Leadership Forum at inner city housing project, Habitation Jeanne Mance, representing four sectors is stepping stone to setting up smaller forums in five residential blocks of the community.

Internal: Youth cluster meeting in Ottawa provides C.Y.F. training for "All Area" youth cluster.

Contradiction: Launching and maintaining a second front to insure that the battle stays comprehensive. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Regional Team building picks up momentum through design and mailing of invitations for special monthly Roundtable and the printing and distribution of 500 newsletters. Eventfulness highlights Regional Team building with celebrative send-outs of Computer PSU team to Chicago and send-out breakfast for colleagues David and Ann Patterson to South America. Preparing and tooling of Regional Team continues through Marketing PSU and Area Youth Cluster/CYF pedagogy in Ottawa.

Internal: House life revitalization happens through study of Bonhoffer's "Community" paper and discovery of Roundtable as a spirit-filled event which "stops" the week and gives distance.

Contradiction: Redesigning fragmented, uncoordinated back-up systems and procedures to enable effective missional operation and monitoring of marketing campaign. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Development circuit sets up future funding as Regional Colloquy proposals are delivered to key prospects. Human Development I marketing meets with on-target response in prospective HDZ as City Hall is offered for site.

Internal: CYF pedagogy brings together Area youth cluster for missional planning.

Internal: House celebrates Roundtable using indigenous literature from South America. A special task force creates permanent decor, and the House is prepared for second Evening at the Institute. House completes Week 5 fasting, celebrating with pizza, ice cream and *delicias* (cookies) for dessert.

Contradiction: Operating as a public organization when in reality almost nobody knows that ICA is in Mexico, which indicates a need to engage the support network immediately. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: ICA Ltd. for the Caribbean nears incorporation with six prominent Jamaicans and one Barbadian signing Articles of Memorandum. House conducts Cluster mini-consults in Richmond Vale, Richmond Gap, Cedar Valley and Grove and Windsor Forest with 200 villagers participating. Basic Services Project (Government of Jamaica and UNICEF) requests \$8,500 proposal for Cluster training component. Framing includes speaking to Jamaica Agricultural Society, meeting Permanent-Secretary of Local Government and receiving positive signals from USAID official.

Internal: Roundtable and House meeting provide depth reflection of life and mission.

Contradiction: Shifting dates on quarter timeline and uncertain mountain transport call for new look at Cluster phasing. (Wk. 5)*

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Peruvian government secures a donation from the private sector to provide basic materials for demonstration electrification project in Azpitia. Regional team meets to project the project intensification and extension plan for the year. Teachers from Lima have first planning session with auxiliary and school director to project children's summer program.

Internal: Manuel Samayoa arrives just in time to participate in House Council that gives a new sense of direction for the auxiliary team.

Contradiction: Concretizing attendance and funding for the Training School in the midst of multiple fronts of activity. (Wk. 4)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Successful site visit is held with diplomatic wives from seven countries and the Dutch ambassador. First Caracas "Guild" meeting is held in the office of the president of Royal Bank of Venezuela, and a plan for the economic revitalization of the Barlovento Region is created. Cano Negro leadership meets to plan the community workday for the upcoming Training Module. Eighteen representatives from the cluster villages are registered for the Training Module.

Team participates in signal breakthrough by enabling assignment and send out of Raul Jorquera from Sol to be on faculty of Peru (Area Lima) HDTS.

Internal: House team receives six-month temporary residence visas and Chilean identification cards as culmination of two-month maneuver.

Contradiction: Operating without a power of attorney. (Wk. 5)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Rio Bonito team meeting with six community people reflects on Kenya model adaptation for Rio Bonito clusters and works on gridding municipality to possible cluster areas. The House initiates development with visits to two key guardians resulting in at least two months funding. Arthur Anderson reviews first six months of 1981 books and pronounces them very good.

Internal: First Saturday Weekly Ritual using India ritual is launched, the second Roundtable with Brazil study is an interlude in the week, and new Portuguese language books bring structure to House's daily Portuguese classes.

Contradiction: Clarifying basic arenas of missional responsibility. (Wk. 3)

The key contradiction lies in the arena of how to enable creation of regional teams which will nurture potential patrons and development colleagues over the long haul.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports hosting Adrian College students in global context with 5th City site visit and courses in the ethical issues of world food. Visit with Hans Kung, Catholic theologian, at the Chicago Divinity School initiated reflection on Ecumenical Theology as preparation for dialogue with other religious faiths. Profound Commitment course preparation creates five initial lectures 4x4's and lesson plans for four seminar sessions. Depth Leadership Lab in refined form is taught in Lincoln, Nebraska, by Nexus and Area San Francisco faculty with the regional team. The contradiction lies in the arena of band meeting interchange and scheduling, holidays, contextual councils, a Quarter III marketing campaign, the Pacific Training Institute and the Australian Summer Program put band meeting into full orbit.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports five marketing treks to Areas to test and develop approach for January program marketing campaign. Phase I completes initial week of High School cluster treks. Teams finalize and write up new edge of three courses: Imaginal Education, CS-I, and the Local Community Planning Colloquy. 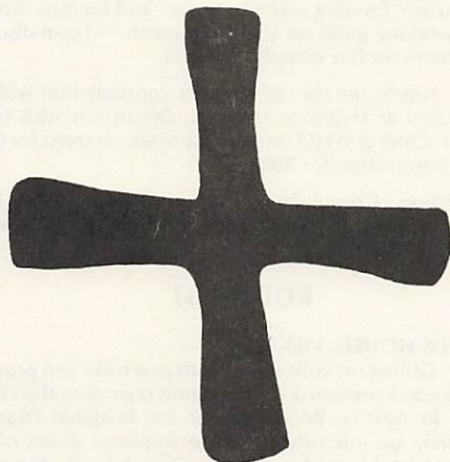
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Holding the corporate input and sustaining structures while expanding comprehensive strategy for the many tasks. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Glasgow circuit team makes contact with long-standing clergy colleagues and is introduced to Y.M.C.A. International Centre, run by lady of 70 recently returned from 30 years in India. House sends Sylvia Francis to Cardiff Volunteers Orientation Weekend.

External: Collegiums on report from Lamego, self-support PSU design and broodings toward Continental Council occasion push in brooding on three-year designs.

Internal: Use of space experiment intensifies with new space designs for Roundtable and team meetings and shift in locations of telephones.

Contradiction: Naming the leap to be symbolized at the December Continental Council. (Wk. 4)*

Contradiction: Guarding time for critical strategic action that will create a new regional team while carrying out necessary administrative tasks. (Wk. 4)

Recruiting for the Imaginal Education course picks up intensity as course weekend draws near. A "yes" is received from the Lutheran Church for the temporary use of a small unfurnished flat.

Internal: House retrieves a wardrobe (clothes closet) from the trash pick-up point — with minor repair it will be very serviceable.

Contradiction: Making the Imaginal Education course a signal Austrian event by turning the "maybes" into "yeses". (Wk. 6)*

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA

External: Family Planning Department holds a six-day conference at the Bayad Community Center. Site visit on the final day opens possibilities for ICA assistance beyond the Bayad Cluster.

Internal: Illnesses and accidents reduce the effectiveness of the troops and compound the practices of the House.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate clarity on the quarter's thrust when major anticipated building blocks refuse to settle into place. (Wk. 8)*

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: After a year's wait, the telephone is installed and working! (44-34-74). Member of Parliament and his wife come to dinner; and neighbors, a Jesuit community, invite House to lunch. House next door becomes vacant and is made available to ICA, providing crucially needed space — new ICA office and additional staff housing.

Internal: New inkind file cabinet signals creation of new office. New English teaching job for oil company provides income to pay major outstanding debts.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on staff and development expansion so that recent victorious leaps don't become comfortable plateaus. (Wk. 4)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: LENS held with Latex Club and wives, members of the Ubakala Tribe from Imo State, outlines ways the club can serve their home villages. House spends week in strategizing and writing manoeuvres for the next 16 weeks, through the HDTP.

Internal: Arrival of Rafos family to new assignment, return of Lee Ferguson from European trip as part of Christian Health Association of Nigeria permeation job, and visit of Jim Campbell from Brussels Nexus, provide full complement of staff to release planning for the future.

Contradiction: Discerning the priority tactics that will give a powerful focus to move team beyond planning into actuation. (Wk. 5)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: All five Kapini stakes participate in block making for Diamond of Zambia Clinic and produce 500 blocks. K.H.D.P. Disco hosts 100 youth to launch Youth Organization and collects K 49. Visit with District Governor firms up authorization for expansion work and begins registration process for Diamond of Zambia, while at the same time formation trek begins in Lusaka.

Internal: House receives Ian Kayo, Friday Chibale and Elias Mbewe as interns for one year. Twenty meters of blue cloth are inkinded to intentionalize Order symbol, and House task force meets for productive session, completing Internal Life Guide for Quarter II.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension among task, troops and programmes in forging one missional task. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: The first division impact programme begins with Miskwani Sub Location Impact Event, including six villages and the sub location as a whole. The whole programme includes 37 sub locations and 222 villages to do. Mr. Njango, Minister of Constitutional and Home Affairs, presents a cheque to ICA from Rattansi Trust. A finance PSU releases new images and models for cash flow and funding.

Internal: Staff puts final touches on House beginning-of-year with painting, decor and floor waxing, capped by Halloween pumpkin and kids "trick or treating".

Contradiction: Focusing on missional priorities demands new ways of coordination and integrating corporate planning and action. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

External: Representatives of Agriculture Guild tour Karen and Kikuyu Demonstration Plots with Agricultural Extension Officer. Twenty bags of inkinded cement are delivered via "petrol only" transport for continued *murram* block production. Demonstration Structure I/New Clinic Facility — painting is in process with glass in windows and will be ready for opening early D@ember. Demonstration Structure II/Adult Education Centre — 6500 blocks are already produced.

Internal: Mzee Mwaura and wife, Hannah, provide *chapatis* and mung beans with soda as Samuel celebrates event of his 59th birthday.

Contradiction: Maintaining balanced perspective between possible transformed lives in Kabiro and possible transformed environment in Kabiro while building models; "if only" is a great excuse. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: In the great week of Hamisi A Sub Location Cluster Consult, no day goes by with less than 80 participants and the opening and closing celebrations approach 200 mark. Simultaneously, the team begins set-up of the next consult to be held in two weeks.

Internal: House sends out Pat Coffman to Bungoma and receives Eddison Mwaylumu from Kusa by design and James Wambua from Kusa by error. All participate in great celebration of the completed consult.

Contradiction: Transparentizing the tightness of the time design which presently creates vulnerability of unreliable *matatus* and missing assistant chiefs. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

The visits of the District Community Development Officer and the District Adult Education Officer as chief guests of the closing beings home to sub location that on-behalf-of development is possible. Singing and dancing flow out from each village commissioning.

Internal: House celebrates the completion of the Giathaini Sub Location Cluster Consult with special meal of pouris, dhall, sweet budgia and beef stew prepared by K. K. Tupe. House meeting exudes a new declaration of corporateness.

Contradiction: Enabling effective internal House operation while being forced to focus heavily on everyday external tasks. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: New breakloose of method allows House to begin impact of Iveti Location as beginning of campaign to impact 200 (approximate) villages in Central Division around Muputi Location Cluster. Other three clusters in section C send six people for training and impact support.

Internal: House celebrates birth of Lloyd Edward Philbrook at Weekly Ritual.

Contradiction: Being with the villagers, seeing their victories, celebrating them and then creating the new myth. (Wk. 5)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: All centurms take advantage of holiday slow-down to reorganize and re-image next month's campaigns. Team sends out Lindsays to SEAPAC.

Internal: Tuesday evening *Divali* celebration with feast and fireworks is followed by IERD workshop, providing corporate stew for talking paper and quarter tasks.

Contradiction: Experiencing demand, demand, demand, and no clear priorities to respond. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Work begins in Sikror on the demonstration soak-pits — a prototype for a whole village drainage system. Remanoeuvre session on HDZ strategy focuses on a consult design which will context and train the four sectors in Human Development, as well as build a plan for the Zone.

Internal: House celebrates *Deepavali* — the festival of light. Gas stove transforms cooking capacity.

Contradiction: Putting anxieties about the HDZ in pockets and giving passion to the next two months' manoeuvres. (Wk. 6)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Two from the Region say "yes" to HDTI in Maliwada Week 8. New contact visits Nadlapur, signs up for HDTI, and then spends two weeks on development. Four village Panchayats are visited for December Village Leaders Institute.

Internal: Sunday evening finds two adults and four E.G. in Ashram with circuit teams in Hyderabad and Bangalore and two on HDTI faculty.

Contradiction: Seeing how two remaining troops can go four directions not covered by other circuits. (Wk. 6)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Reviewing Quarter II manoeuvres releases new insights on operating effectively in the city. Clear directions on education and bustee strategies and how to highlight Panchayat visit are formed as a result of two-day think-tank atmosphere during Kali Puja festivities.

Internal: The second birthday celebration for Sarita Prasad, held at the height of Kali Puja, turns into a great evening's fun for colleagues, neighbours and House with fireworks, and a game of forfeits.

Contradiction: Building momentum in city arenas of education, LENS and Panchayat events with troops disbursed in other regions. (Wk. 5)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Management receives Malaysian audit report that ICA passed with flying colours. Operations team returns after multi-purpose PSU in Bubun and Bontoa with reports that PSU model will be helpful in all regions. IERD-Lindsay trek set-up moves fast and furious with appointments set in Australia and Indonesia.

Internal: Visit with future landlord reveals deeply caring man with potential of opening many doors for Malaysian frame and programme. Total Nexus reassembles after four-week dispersement. House receives cheque for second self-support consultancy.

Contradiction: Creating the common images of the rest of the quarter which allow centrums and nexus to move effectively as a whole. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Kuala Lumpur corporation agrees to grant time off with pay for Abdullah Wahab, a Sungai Lui youth, to conduct Community Forums for a week in neighboring state of Negri Sembilan. Team holds first formal meeting with Sungai Lui leadership after moving ICA residence, a positive step toward sustaining local initiative, as plans are set for building a new community hall.

Internal: House experiences celebrative week including *Deepavali* (Indian Hindu New Year) feast with a board member family, Kavita James' birthday party with the Nexus, and an open house for regional colleagues at the new House.

Contradiction: Keeping quarter's priorities before team so that sustained effort is directed toward major thrusts. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Bubun Goat Training is great success for treatment and preventive care of goats, now second only to ducks in Bubun's diversified economy. Bubun Third Year Report radically addresses House, village and guardians with the large increase of money circulating in the village. Jakarta newspaper reporter visits to do story of the fishermen's success in the Bubun coastal villages, and someone suggests that the President should come for a visit because this is the only successful fishing village project in the nation.

Internal: New E.G. set-up makes everyone feel at home, and wild Halloween party complete with masks reminds House again of "The Other World within this world".

Contradiction: Getting Bubun village to celebrate their life together. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Guardians continue to take on advocacy roles with Vice President Malik appointment, Lindsay hosting and Dutch proposal. House sees new possible sign of cooperation with Directorate General of Non-Formal Education, Youth and Sports in the nation.

Internal: Holiday refreshes House with Halloween magic and long-range school preparation while Retting and Neat complete first week of Global Language School at PTP Training Center in Yogyakarta earning \$7,000 for self-support for twenty working days. McCabe from Ujung Pandang arrives enroute to Yogya for Global Language School assignment.

Contradiction: Risking decisive action relative to regional program in the face of uncertain government consensus and unconcretized model for the future. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: All staff are kept busy as framing visits to Ujung Pandang are made in midst of cluster villages circuit to set up Week 7 Social Module. Immediacy of project's third anniversary celebration (HUT III) generates much excitement and activity. Villagers take entire responsibility for necessary preparation, including rebuilding and whitewashing the bamboo fence around the village green.

Internal: Discontinuous aspect is held this week as entire House joyously participates in the two-day wedding of ICA staff member, Amir Bintang. Wedding occurs in best Indonesian style with procession, feasting and traditional dress.

Contradiction: Finishing 1982-83 plan with diverse priorities and utilizing key wisdom of the House prior before he leaves for three weeks to be on staff of Global Language School. (Wk. 4)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Appointments set for Sir James Lindsay's visit provide excellent frame for Hong Kong. Management makes progress on statutory regulations through legal advisor.

Internal: Music and John Telford set Halloween mood and atmosphere providing celebrative time.

Contradiction: Creating image and structure to hold needs of self-support, regional services and program support. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: North Dakota agricultural study group returns from trip to China and is hosted at ICA reception and film show at American Club with 41 present from all four sectors. Afterwards they report to House and area priors on their experience of China's development. A day-long tour of Hong Kong's five New Towns demonstrates the end of the rural in the New Territories.

Internal: House celebrates Frank Hillard's 50th birthday with champagne and gift of a brass statue of a Chinese general.

Contradiction: Having our planning catch up with our doing. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: First village youth program to utilize outside professional help — one dentist and one magician — nets 231 children and a handful of adults for five evening programs in five villages including Hai Ou. Chinese staff are sent to Taipei for training in LENS for Caterpillar course while eight registrations for Hai Ou Imaginal Education course come in the mail. New motorcycle, financed by employer at no interest, replaces two which suddenly stopped working.

Contradiction: Clarifying program images that are at the same time acceptable to Government and motivating to the staff. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House deposits NT 202,000 (US \$5,300) for month of October and finalizes LENS with ITC (Caterpillar) for November 6-8, 1981.

Internal: Area priors visit en route from Hong Kong to Manila, and Doug Druckenmiller and Bob McLaughlin visit for one night, sharing stories of their visit to China mainland, Nam Wai, Hong Kong and Hai Ou, Taiwan.

Contradiction: Maintaining a vision of local people participating directly in comprehensive planning. (Wk. 5)*

Contradiction: Orchestrating 24 manoeuvres that will turn all the heads of all the sectors. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: San Miguel decides to sign land agreement for health clinic use. Sudtonggan accomplishes 33 plots of income-generating vegetables, while 2,500 pieces of rock are delivered to Manila with 240 pieces average production per day. Mactan 24 weights are completed. Team begins implementation of one-year calendar of Sudtonggan Leadership School.

Internal: Selling of old newspapers and corn, soya, and milk bags raises money to improve House decor, and celebration with all ages participating highlights week.

Contradiction: Enabling movement into the new possibility of Mactan 24 while waiting for resources to sustain the programs. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Fifty mothers attend the family planning lecture and film showing sponsored by the Region XI Commission on Population. Carmen Preschool garden is fenced, and Lapaz General Store inventory totals 10,000.

Internal: Village representatives and preschool teachers meet.

Contradiction: Getting a preschool building. (Wk. 4)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: With the visit of Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay, the first member of the Japanese IERD board is enlisted. The first one-day meeting of the Regional Team endeavors to impart 25 years of history and move into a new mode of operation.

Internal: With guest dynamic whirl, the House enjoys evening collegiums with John Burbage and Lady Peggy.

Contradiction: Seeing the IERD as part of the five-year strategy and more than a ten-day event. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Five women from last year's biggest donor, Seoul International Women's Association, visit the Cheong Won Cluster and set off a chain reaction of good-will in their husbands' companies, including a fine development visit with Saehan Motors (General Motors).

Internal: The Lindsays come to town for a three-day impact event on the Region and the House.

Contradiction: Effectively following through on the Lindsay visit to obtain Cluster funding. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

The first two of a series of Korean visitors arrive on Saturday; Miss Oh and Miss Park bring news, gifts and beautiful singing voices while giving House opportunity to visit a shrine and take part in a Tea Ceremony.

Internal: New jobs start for Bob and Joyce, and Regional Newsletter will be typed by Business College students this week. Old colleague Mr. Minagawa renews vital relationship with House.

Contradiction: Recruiting the Business Module Day as a sign of future possibilities in Fukuoka. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

Contradiction: Developing a cohesive picture of the total campaign while operating on a number of different fronts. (Wk. 7)*

Internal: House is unexpectedly addressed by a conversation on fasting and by Paul — on sin and grace. Margaret receives delivery of a new car for the House and programme.

Contradiction: Inventing the eventfulness that recruits participants for the Australia Summer '82 training event. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Area LENS trek with Frank and Isobel makes framing, LENS and probe calls and finds key opportunities in Cairns and Brisbane.

Internal: House does collegium on the "myth-ing" link paper. The paper in three parts — myth makers, spirit prowess and field experiment — reveals the myth factor as intriguing window to the future.

Contradiction: Stating the Region's story corporately. (Wk. 5)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

enough to incorporate the reality of fundamental changes which occur regularly as the mission sharpens its focus. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: ICA Ltd. for the Caribbean nears incorporation with six prominent Jamacians and one Barbadian signing Articles of Memorandum. House conducts Cluster mini-consults in Richmond Vale, Richmond Gap, Cedar Valley and Grove and Windsor Forest with 200 villagers participating. Basic Services Project (Government of Jamaica and UNICEF) requests \$8,500 proposal for Cluster training component. Framing includes speaking to Jamaica Agricultural Society, meeting Permanent-Secretary of Local Government and receiving positive signals from USAID official.

Internal: Roundtable and House meeting provide depth reflection of life and mission.

Contradiction: Shifting dates on quarter timeline and uncertain mountain transport call for new look at Cluster phasing. (Wk. 5)

Contradiction: Maintaining pressure on all points of advantage while giving necessary care to arenas of immediate specific concern. (Wk. 6)*

Internal: House team receives six-month temporary residence visas and Chilean identification cards as culmination of two-month maneuver.

Contradiction: Operating without a power of attorney. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Total of US \$5,000 is committed so far in development towards this year's budget while cash in hand is sufficient to get team through another month and make commitments for rest of year. First draft of Rio Bonito municipal project proposal is written.

Internal: House celebrates development victory at fourth Roundtable in a row.

Contradiction: Reworking image of project initiation to a longer term, including a new staff training program, without losing current advantages. (Wk. 5)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports first training session for Student House computer team and announces \$5,000 in kind from Trull Foundation and \$40,000 in mail from anonymous donor. Information systems PSU implementation moves ahead with decision narrowed to two possible micro computers to use for word processing. The key contradiction lies in the arena of how to enable creation of regional teams which will nurture potential patrons and development colleagues over the long haul.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports hosting Adrian College students in global context with 5th City site visit and courses in the ethical issues of world food. Visit with Hans Kung, Catholic theologian, at the Chicago Divinity School initiated reflection on Ecumenical Theology as preparation for dialogue with other religious faiths. Profound Commitment course preparation creates five initial lectures 4x4x4's and lesson plans for four seminar sessions. Depth Leadership Lab in refined form is taught in Lincoln, Nebraska, by Nexus and Area San Francisco faculty with the regional team. The contradiction lies in the arena of band meeting interchange and scheduling, holidays, contextual councils, a Quarter III marketing campaign, the Pacific Training Institute and the Australian Summer Program put band meeting into full orbit.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Chicago supporting the largest programmatic week of the quarter with 12 events: one RS-I, one LENS, three CS-I courses, two Imaginal Education courses, three Phase I treks, and two Marketing treks. 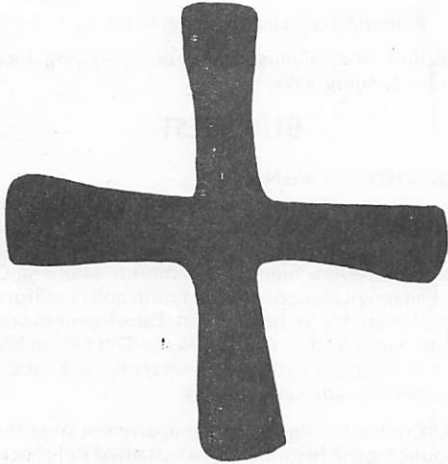
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: HDZ Portugal prints its first Global Order Report, visits nine communities, does five *encounters* (forums) and sets up four more, produces winning documents from the five communities at the Assembly and celebrates with a fine local wine and dancing. Ferreiros does a three-month task timeline, including assignments, in forum follow-up session.

Internal: Team visits Vila Real, one of the four district cities, to see richer side of the Rio Douro-Sul. Lucy and Russell step back into pre-medieval time in the walled section of Lamego, and Team sends Jim Campbell out on a perilous bus trip toward civilization and Brussels.

Contradiction: Learning to tell time by which community is scheduled. . . "If this is Ferreirim, it must be Wednesday." (Wk. 7)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: LENS is set up with a voluntary organization to take place in February. Another voluntary organization shows great interest in idea of adopting a community in the Third World, preferably an agricultural one as they are largely a farming community.

Internal: Whole House goes to see the Lord Mayor's Show, an historic and highly colorful event that takes place annually in the City of London. House gives Tony Margritts great send out to India.

Contradiction: Surging ahead with programmes so fast that development and office systems lag behind. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Glasgow circuit team makes contact with long-standing clergy colleagues and is introduced to Y.M.C.A. International Centre, run by lady of 70 recently returned from 30 years in India. House sends Sylvia Francis to Cardiff Volunteers Orientation Weekend.

Internal: House is insulated throughout with inkind materials from local businesses and experiences evening of intense creativity planning November Colloquy.

Contradiction: Deciding the one major thrust for the year that allows all the parts to fall into place. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Development team secures commitments for regular support from two regional team families via Deed of Covenant. First session of village study group is scheduled for first week of Advent and first fund-raising film night is scheduled for January.

Internal: Saturday night and soft music sees completion of regional mailing labels. Workshop with development team fills the tactics board with multi-coloured events for the next 14 months.

Contradiction: Tightening belt without cutting off circulation. (Wk. 8)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Ten well-planned visits result in 11 eager participants for Volunteers Orientation Day.

Internal: House undergoes breathtaking so-near-and-yet-so-far experience as nuns at the eleventh hour change their minds about hiring Beverly Parker.

Contradiction: Deciding which puppies to drown as programme possibilities whelp simultaneously. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Collegiums on report from Lamego, self-support PSU design and broodings toward Continental Council occasion push in brooding on three-year designs.

Internal: Use of space experiment intensifies with new space designs for Roundtable and team meetings and shift in locations of telephones.

Contradiction: Naming the leap to be symbolized at the December Continental Council. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: A week of structural permeation includes — playing at a concert in the key node of the potential HDZ, receiving letters from Canada indicating probable funding for women's program, attending a strategy meeting of the Brussels' group of the "Planetary Initiative for the World We Choose" and the fifth study meeting of the Women's Organisation For Equality. The fruit of many years of patient cultivation ripens unseen and falls unexpectedly into the team's lap in the shape of a 150-room facility relieving the space contradiction relative to training centre expansion.

Internal: House celebrates the regular stipend cheque, the new facility and the 35th anniversary of Paige Cousineau at the house-warming dinner of Ruth Dickinson, an ex-sojourner, with duck and "incroyable shoe" pastries.

Contradiction: Forging the programmatic bridges that will allow Those Who Care to begin taking the steps to dance over the void. (Wk. 6)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Ludwigshafen momentum continues as follow-up meeting schedules implementation workshop for January. Two development appointments with Arthur Anderson and Women's Bazaar mark the beginning of two weeks with development. Yvonne is sent to teach Imaginal Education in Vienna, marking first event in new area.

Internal: Three job offers are received. House plans until midnight in getting hold on new rhythm demanded by new jobs.

Contradiction: Needing to expand thinking and strategy to mid-1982 while experiencing the crunch of this quarter's bottom lines. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The first Formation Colloquy for the globe is a great success beginning with a weekend Human Development Training course in Dutch followed by a statistical analysis of Amsterdam (in light of the five major priorities of the Regional Consult) and ending with a plenary-council building six manoeuvres for the next six months. Representatives from all sectors are involved in the Colloquy journey and the future planning.

Internal: The collegium dynamic keeps House grounded with work on a sojourn evaluation program, Research Band report and Families in Mission proposal; while workshops in Day 2, help to tie together the internal/external.

Contradiction: Reconciling the need to remanoeuvre with all the input from the Formation Colloquy while holding on to the old strategies for stability. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Four Guardians represent Berlin Region at the Annual ICA Board meeting in Frankfurt to update legal status.

Internal: Demonstration Roundtable is held as first step toward Roundtable in German.

Contradiction: Standing in tension between caring so much and having to hang loose. (Wk. 5)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: House holds first Seminar for Effective Mission in the Regional Training Center. This victory demonstrates the viability of doing many such events in House facility on a regular basis.

Internal: The Team makes an investment in the future by planting a garden which will enrich the House diet and cut the food budget come spring.

Contradiction: Building fresh tactics which will help carry out quarter's maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Meeting with Global Director General of International Hospital Federation releases new names for World Health Organization conference and ICA urban programme. House reworks Quarter II timeline to include explosion of House events between now and Christmas. A model construct for an Urban Issues Symposium is created with the Guides and Scouts Committee on Ethnic Affairs.

Internal: Potential colleagues drop in to satisfy their curiosity.

Contradiction: Articulating a saleable on-going local programme for funding. (Wk. 7)*

BUDAPEST**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Twenty participants in Imaginal Education weekend (taught in German) make an impact on St. Claret Church. The methods find practical application in planning for Advent celebration in the new highrise community where St. Claret is located. Pedagogical support from Berlin and Frankfurt makes this a signal event for Vienna Region. Development continues throughout week with a team of Nexus and House knocking on doors of religious orders and receiving \$600 in cash and several times that amount working.

Internal: Contract is signed for an apartment near the inner city announcing the beginning of a sustained Religious House presence in Austria.

Contradiction: Taking a 100-year-old Baroque style apartment and turning it into a "House demonstration of futuric social style". (Wk. 7)*

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA**

External: Family Planning Department holds a six-day conference at the Bayad Community Center. Site visit on the final day opens possibilities for ICA assistance beyond the Bayad Cluster.

Internal: Illnesses and accidents reduce the effectiveness of the troops and compound the practices of the House.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate clarity on the quarter's thrust when major anticipated building blocks refuse to settle into place. (Wk. 8)

ABIDJAN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: After a year's wait, the telephone is installed and working! (44-34-74). Member of Parliament and his wife come to dinner; and neighbors, a Jesuit community, invite House to lunch. House next door becomes vacant and is made available to ICA, providing crucially needed space — new ICA office and additional staff housing.

Internal: New inkind file cabinet signals creation of new office. New English teaching job for oil company provides income to pay major outstanding debts.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on staff and development expansion so that recent victorious leaps don't become comfortable plateaus. (Wk. 4)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Circuit to Eastern Region introduces Rafos family to colleagues, sets up December LENS with Nigerpharm Company, and hears a report from Professor Udakwu on his global trip and the warm reception of ICA around the world.

Internal: Spirit life comes alive with exciting collegiums on Africa, Global Roundtable constructs and new meal formats.

Contradiction: Giving concrete form to strategic directions for the year that hold comprehensive programme needs. (Wk. 6)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: All five Kapini stakes participate in block making for Diamond of Zambia Clinic and produce 500 blocks. K.H.D.P. Disco hosts 100 youth to launch Youth Organization and collects K 49. Visit with District Governor firms up authorization for expansion work and begins registration process for Diamond of Zambia, while at the same time formation trek begins in Lusaka.

Internal: House receives Ian Kayo, Friday Chibale and Elias Mbewe as interns for one year. Twenty meters of blue cloth are inked to intentionalize Order symbol, and House task force meets for productive session, completing Internal Life Guide for Quarter II.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension among task, troops and programmes in forging one missional task. (Wk. 2)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: First Section Houses meeting and National Project Directors meeting culminate week of presentations to Rotary, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance. Geographic coverage features Women's Advancement Module and Management Seminar on Kenya's eastern border, and second sub-location cluster consult on Kenya's western coast border.

Internal: Celebration reigns with inked birthday party at Nairobi Hotel for six-week-old Section Houses and four staff members.

Contradiction: Designing carefully monitored grant implementation scheme that allows responsibility in dealing with cash flow, paying back debts, and complying with past grants. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

External: While finishing touches of paint and window glass are being put to new facility for Kabiro Clinic, the *harambee* block making pushes against its timeline with only two weeks to complete 9,000 blocks. Picture taking is completed for first phase of CCF participation to begin in January. Kabiro HDP Self-Help Community Development Committee starts work on constitution and by-laws by spelling out its purpose.

Internal: Upon returning from final burial ceremony for grandmother, Sam Were moves into assignment as Section B "gun" while family remains in Kabiro until new daughter, Lois, and mother can move into new assignment location.

Contradiction: Developing skills and confidence in ICA African staff and in villagers that enables care for not only "wheels squeaking loudest", but also for those whose squeak has become part of daily tune and are no longer really heard. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: In the great week of Hamisi A Sub Location Cluster Consult, no day goes by with less than 80 participants and the opening and closing celebrations approach 200 mark. Simultaneously, the team begins set-up of the next consult to be held in two weeks.

Internal: House sends out Pat Coffman to Bungoma and receives Eddison Mwaylumu from Kusa by design and James Wambua from Kusa by error. All participate in great celebration of the completed consult.

Contradiction: Transparentizing the tightness of the time design which presently creates vulnerability of unreliable *matatus* and missing assistant chiefs. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Githembu Sub-Location Cluster Consult opens with excited villagers participating in the opening, government visits, making the sign boards and serving "ready-made" pot-luck food. The District Officer in attendance at the closing promises to grade the roads.

Internal: House welcomes Section gun Sam Were, and Julius Muli and Elijah Irungu, both arriving for the cluster consult.

Contradiction: Keeping old plates spinning while hastily spinning new plates. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: Cluster staff interchange takes place for second time this quarter with two from Kamualla cluster and two from Kakusui going on circuits in Muputi Location, completing Misakwami Sub Location Impact and setting up Kaliami Sub Location, thus initiating Central Division impact design. Programme implementation module team returns to Kitandi to initiate community centre. Muputi Location offices LENS has almost 90% participation of those invited.

Internal: Training is held for second division impact team and Mwarakaya Sub Location Consult team is welcomed back in midst of National Project Directors Meeting at Kammelani.

Contradiction: Knowing that staff have all the string required to weave location cluster together but still unsure what the product will look like. (Wk. 7)*

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Dramatic shift in financial situation occurs with receipt of Rs. 150,000 and by having inked team on the road.

Internal: A week of celebrations sends teams across the continent including Raymond Spencer and John Burbidge, receives volunteer Antia Ottka from Frankfurt and Brian Robins from the hospital, and wraps it all up at an open-house in new Phase I space.

Contradiction: Producing big enough picture of the rest of the year to allow effective moves this quarter in catalysing the year. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Maliwada piped water drinking system is inaugurated by Shri Ramrao Adik, Maharashtra Minister for Industries.

Internal: Internal life is transformed with arrival of HDTI faculty and the corporate effort in the Ashram garden.

Contradiction: Building actuation momentum in the cluster villages in the midst of dealing with single issues. (Wk. 7)*

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: *Shramdan* has become a way of life for Sikror villagers as another week produces yet another paved street. Faridabad (HDZ) Rotary Club hosts a showing of "The World of Human Development" and pledges its full support.

Internal: Bhojar family is sent out to Maliwada HDTI faculty as the next step on their family priorship journey.

Contradiction: Finding the breakloose in village visits which will ground the zone story. (Wk. 6)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Canara Bank invites ICA to work with it in two of its project villages in both Bangalore and Madras. Eight of the Bank's top 15 executives are visited, and Canara Bank conducts ICA on site visits to prospective villages in Bangalore and Madras. ICA Hyderabad secures new facility in Secunderabad, only a few minutes from both the airport and the train station.

Internal: Collegial estate agent takes ICA under its wing and does very convincing ICA pitch on house owner, resulting in a Yes to ICA as tenants.

Contradiction: Creating climate for four-year strategic bold moves when the immediacies of troops, time and money dominate the weather pattern. (Wk. 7)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First Bustee Guild meeting thinks through strategy and training models. Set up for Lindsay visit moves forward with visit to K. C. Mehra of Tata Company. Education blitz preparation continues and team of four leaves for extended training programme with Holy Cross Polytechnic for Women at Hazaribagh.

Internal: House is at full strength for first time this year with arrival of Manoj Prasad from Bombay. Week II task force creates E.G. curriculum events for next four weeks and lesson plans for coming week as new space of back room is claimed with permanent decor.

Contradiction: Using imminent Panchayat, Lindsay and Development treks to focus quarter schedule and rationale. (Wk. 6)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Management receives Malaysian audit report that ICA passed with flying colours. Operations team returns after multi-purpose PSU in Bubun and Bontoa with reports that PSU model will be helpful in all regions. IERD-Lindsay trek set-up moves fast and furious with appointments set in Australia and Indonesia.

Internal: Visit with future landlord reveals deeply caring man with potential of opening many doors for Malaysian frame and programme. Total Nexus reassembles after four-week dispersement. House receives cheque for second self-support consultancy.

Contradiction: Creating the common images of the rest of the quarter which allow centurms and nexus to move effectively as a whole. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Team completes Malaysian Town Meeting series in Mukim Johol, District Kuala Pilah, as remaining five of the twelve villages in Johol hold Town Meetings during a five-day trek by the ICA. Abdulla Wahab from Sungai Lui and new colleague Dolsaid Hasan, Johol village resident, both play solid roles as session leaders. Visit to the Japanese Bazaar at the Japan Club reaffirms collegial relationship with Mrs. Loo, donor of ICA regional office in Kuala Lumpur.

Internal: New inkind refrigerator and gas cooker arrive from Singer Singapore in time to enable preparation for Japanese feast to celebrate Kuala Pilah Town Meeting victory.

Contradiction: Getting into focus the plan for major quarter events including Continental Council and Sir James Lindsay and Panchayat visits. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Bubun Three Year Celebration and Turning Over Ceremony preparations hit high gear as women, youth and men have workdays and special meetings to make it a great celebration, complete with water competitions. Teluk Bakung begins eighth preschool, a formal preschool celebration is held in another village with Bubun preschool teachers on circuit, and the head of Province Community Education addresses preschool teachers meeting. Health Guild for District (*Kecamatan*) plans workshop for one-year timeline, and agriculture visits include workshop plan with fish-pond volunteer agency.

Internal: Weekend visit of USA Consulate Cultural and Information Attache is delightful excuse for Mactan collegium, "big night in Bubun card game" and gourmet cooking.

Contradiction: Using Lindsay visit to solidify guardian's story of human development demonstration and zone. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay launch the I.E.R.D. in Indonesia with 15 events and visits. They depart for Australia with three new members on the Global Advisory Board — Madame Y. Soetanto, S. H. the Associate Head Minister of the Junior Ministry of Women; Mr. William Sirianjaya, President of the P. T. Astra International; and his Excellency Mr. Adam Malik, Vice President of Indonesia.

Internal: John Burbidge from India arrives to enable Lindsay visit, and Liang Djien The helps with calls while sorting out his Indonesian passport. House is enabled by donation of a fine black sedan and driver for the Lindsays.

Contradiction: Sorting out all the new possibilities into a model that concretizes future government relations and the regional government role. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: All actions are geared to launching the preschool module to be held Weeks 8 and 9, including circuits to five *desa* cluster villages with preschool teacher training in two of them and a blitz on government agencies to elicit their participation and support. Team submits 1982-83 plan and funding proposal to provincial budget review agency. Agriculture module follow-up continues with villages planting more and more hectares of gogoranca.

Internal: Major legal and fiscal victories include visa extensions for expatriots for another month, the *kijung* (House vehicle) re-registration, and new assignment to O.E. books resulting in a balanced checkbook. House studies the *IMAGE* paper, introducing charting method to Indonesian trainees, and celebrates two birthdays, Patty Henschen's 18th and a trainee, Nelly's 20th.

Contradiction: Making agencies clear about ICA's role so that they can be confident about working with House. (Wk. 6)*

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Extraordinary signal framing event happens as Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay see 150 people in ten appointments and 16 events in three days. Four from Nexus join permeation celebration with 17 English teachers from the Kai Tak Vietnamese Refugee evening classes, and the conversation focuses on comprehensive care and engagement.

Internal: Two futuric collegiums impact House — one by Sir James Lindsay on avenues on development in China and the other by John Burbidge on the eight-year image relative to the IERD.

Contradiction: Creating effective systems for the research, training and engagement of those from all sectors who indicate NOW their readiness for practical participation. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: North Dakota agricultural study group returns from trip to China and is hosted at ICA reception and film show at American Club with 41 present from all four sectors. Afterwards they report to House and area priors on their experience of China's development. A day-long tour of Hong Kong's five New Towns demonstrates the end of the rural in the New Territories.

Internal: House celebrates Frank Hillard's 50th birthday with champagne and gift of a brass statue of a Chinese general.

Contradiction: Having our planning catch up with our doing. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: First village youth program to utilize outside professional help — one dentist and one magician — nets 231 children and a handful of adults for five evening programs in five villages including Hai Ou. Chinese staff are sent to Taipei for training in LENS for Caterpillar course while eight registrations for Hai Ou Imaginal Education course come in the mail. Appointment is set for ICA to introduce three village people to Tung Kang Marine Laboratory — the lab whose technology catalyzed prawn production explosion in Hai Ou.

Internal: House experiences victory of translation, certification and notarizing of the birth certificate for the new Salve baby, Rose Megvey, after discovering that the Indian Consulate in Hong Kong would not accept the original Chinese certificate which did not have the child's name on it. New motorcycle, financed by employer at no interest, replaces two which suddenly stopped working.

Contradiction: Clarifying program images that are at the same time acceptable to Government and motivating to the staff. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: House deposits NT 202,000 (US \$5,300) for month of October and finalizes LENS with ITC (Caterpillar) for November 6-8, 1981.

Internal: Area priors visit en route from Hong Kong to Manila, and Doug Druckenmiller and Bob McLaughin visit for one night, sharing stories of their visit to China mainland, Nam Wai, Hong Kong and Hai Ou, Taiwan.

Contradiction: Maintaining a vision of local people participating directly in comprehensive planning. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Manila Consultative Services are underway with Town Meeting type consult for Elinwood UCC congregation; facilitators arrive to find "Fishel-designed" 18-inch tables. Philcom (RCA) LENS follow-up is effective first step in continuing to provide a company with concrete tools, post-LENS. Sudtonggan Rock Industry's third container of rocks in two months is delivered in Manila. Manila Core meeting is hosted by Monseignor Ortiz at his complex where he oversees the coordination of the 43 Roman Catholic agencies and organizations in Manila.

Internal: House finds movie, *TESS*, a powerful art form. The study of Servan-Schreiber's *World Challenge* draws forth creative thinking relative to new global dynamics, balance of power and future options.

Contradiction: Designing the temporal forms that continue to remind the House of its life understanding. (Wk.8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: San Miguel decides to sign land agreement for health clinic use. Sudtonggan accomplishes 33 plots of income-generating vegetables, while 2,500 pieces of rock are delivered to Manila with 240 piece average production per day. Mactan 24 weights are completed. Team begins implementation of one-year calendar of Sudtonggan Leadership School.

Internal: Selling of old newspapers and corn, soya, and milk bags raises money to improve House decor, and a celebration with all ages participating highlights week.

Contradiction: Enabling movement into the new possibility of Mactan 24 while waiting for resources to sustain the programs. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Fifty mothers attend the family planning lecture and film showing sponsored by the Region XI Commission on Population. Carmen Preschool garden is fenced, and Lapaz General Store inventory totals 10,000.

Internal: Village representatives and preschool teachers meet.

Contradiction: Getting a preschool building. (Wk.4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: With the visit of Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay, the first member of the Japanese IERD board is enlisted. The first one-day meeting of the Regional Team endeavors to impart 25 years of history and move into a new mode of operation.

Internal: With guest dynamic whirl, the House enjoys evening collegiums with John Burbage and Lady Peggy.

Contradiction: Seeing the IERD as part of the five-year strategy and more than a ten-day event. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Team visits County Chief in Cholla Nam Do, a southern province, and sets up 30 Town Meetings for Week 8. Commitment is given by Dow Chemical Company to provide food and housing for the Town Meeting teams.

Internal: The gift of the Panchayat visit to Seoul House is well stated by a Korean colleague remarking, "A fresh wind and new spirit has swept over us."

Contradiction: Moving from Korean LENS training to Korean LENS teaching. (Wk.7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: House creates health plan for November, and Health Guilds in four villages begin distribution of parasite analysis containers. Staff are guests of the *Saemaul* Provincial Director who offers many forms of cooperative assistance for the Cluster. Weeks ends with great Cluster Sports Day with over 300 present who enjoy stiff competition in nine events carried out in style with visiting dignitaries, awards and a winner's trophy.

Internal: Um Young Heum, son of Rev. Um Gi Hyun, joins House for four-month sojourn after completing military duty and before university begins.

Contradiction: Getting clear on roles, both the division of assignments and the synthesis of action. (Wk.6)*

House enjoys coffee hours with janitors and residents in apartment lobbies. New contacts with *Entraide Missionnaire* and McGill University chaplaincy keep Team in touch with other programme activities.

Internal: Finishing edges on winterization are completed and edge brooding on residential training events and sojourning cause new images to break loose.

Contradiction: Initiating Colloquy preparation before the Christmas mind-set sets in while bringing off eight forum cluster. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: CYF training session with eight St. Martin High School youth, who attended Symposium, excites and involves youth as they prepare for their school CYF. Area LENS marketing training prepares Area for three-day marketing blitz.

Internal: Youth Trek impacts House with reports and workshops on the youth of the globe. Trek ends with celebration of movies and banana splits.

Contradiction: Structuring effective interchange and coordination of teams. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Registrations for HD-I (Human Development-I) Seminar continue to come in along with prospect suggestions and offers to recruit others from those registering. House joins Halifax House in Toronto for LENS Marketing PSU.

Internal: Toasts with brandy celebrate firm offer to buy 121-123 Sherbrooke Ave. that includes ICA renting 121 Sherbrooke Ave.

Contradiction: Imaging the Regional Colloquy victory in the midst of final manoeuvres that allows House to turn its attention to prepare for Quarter III. (Wk.7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Team holds first meeting in series of four scheduled throughout the Region as follow-up to Atlantic Potential Consult. Task force has key university contacts and Halifax Board of Trade representatives present.

Internal: Mobile Religious House is on the road in Moneton looking for job.

Contradiction: Maintaining the program possibilities in the Region while nailing down self-support. (Wk.6)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY

External: House obtains donated printing for 1,000 Spanish ICA brochures and 1,000 invitations to Evening at the Institute. One Evening at the Institute explodes program possibilities with an invitation for a CYF. Two religious orders have invited proposals to meet the program budget.

Internal: First Evening at the Institute catalyzes a radical transformation of the living room, creating an unique ambience. House experiences new life and motivity through a new turn in structural permeation work.

Contradiction: Moving beyond the daily assignments routine to assignments by maneuver arenas while remaining flexible enough to incorporate the reality of fundamental changes which occur regularly as the mission sharpens its focus. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: ICA Ltd. for the Caribbean nears incorporation with six prominent Jamacians and one Barbadian signing Articles of Memorandum. House conducts Cluster mini-consults in Richmond Vale, Richmond Gap, Cedar Valley and Grove and Windsor Forest with 200 villagers participating. Basic Services Project (Government of Jamaica and UNICEF) requests \$8,500 proposal for Cluster training component. Framing includes speaking to Jamaica Agricultural Society, meeting Permanent-Secretary of Local Government and receiving positive signals from USAID official.

Internal: Roundtable and House meeting provide depth reflection of life and mission.

Contradiction: Shifting dates on quarter timeline and uncertain mountain transport call for new look at Cluster phasing. (Wk. 5)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Training School starts with 24 participants (and four more on their way) representing mining concerns, orders, service organizations, local communities and individuals. Range of participants demonstrates the depth and breadth of care in Area Lima.

Internal: House welcomes Edward Vergara as school faculty and does the "Big Shift" — bringing Packards to Azpitia for the school and sending Newkirks to the Lima House.

Contradiction: Maintaining pressure on all points of advantage while giving necessary care to arenas of immediate specific concern. (Wk.6)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Human Development Lab, a 12-day construct, which is the first extended training just for Barlovento, ends as a great success. Nineteen participants all covenant to "Do Barlovento". New Caracas ICA office is inked free!

Internal: A three-day House retreat is refreshing.

Contradiction: Putting flesh on master designs that is both real and big. (Wk.6)*

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: During the great week of "Three strange angels" (Panchayat team visit), the global presence facilitates a guardian event, a visit with municipal mayor, an extended visit with Sol and several programs, a trek to Santiago's highest hill (San Cristobal) and the receiving of two key names from ICA's lawyer for IERD visits.

Internal: Week of reflection and brooding is spiced by various and sundry celebrations.

Contradiction: Figuring out how to continue with both feet tied behind back. (Wk.6)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Rio Bonito team meeting with new people and Panchayat moves team to new involvement. ICA participates in milk producer's awards ceremony and renews contacts with the dignitaries present there. Third site visit to Bananeiras in two weeks builds excitement in the village.

Internal: Panchayat team arrives. House and Panchayat are impacted by global strategy session from the perspective of Rio de Janeiro. Ed Vergara is sent out to Lima Training School.

Contradiction: Clarifying and doing next steps of municipal pilot launch in midst of a myriad of administrative requirements before December Council and Christmas begin the summer holiday period. (Wk.7)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that the North American Annual Appeal now totals \$1,071,750. A luncheon meeting for Phillip Potter, General Secretary of the World Council of Churches, concludes with a conversation while providing him "taxi" service to the airport. Development personnel play multiple roles in marketing courses, teaching and then "asking'em for money". Senator Molson (Canada) puts \$20,000 in the mail to signal an auspicious start for December. The key contradiction lies in the arena of expanding to other constituencies while maintaining momentum on individual constituency.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports 34th Academy concludes with 44 participants prepared for leadership in the Regional Teams in 13 countries. First in-house pilot of the Profound Commitment Course is held with Chicago Nexus. Fifth revision of the Human Development Course launches the Formation Colloquy in the Ottawa Region. Roundtable construct comes together as the needed kind of care and study for Quarter III. The key contradiction lies in the arena of ensuring that all the plates spinning this month, both in Research Centrum and the total mission, are woven into one drama-filled art form without dropping any of the plates.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that six Formation Colloquies are launched in Brussels, Dallas, Glasgow, Lisbon (Lamego), Madrid and Ottawa Regions. Initiating events include two LENS pedagogies, one RS-I, one HD-I, on Imaginal Education pedagogy and a regional team research weekend. Bombay reports a team in Jawale for Education Module breaks open the possibility of a continuing cluster education structure. Breakthroughs occur in a training program with a Roman Catholic women's order running a girls' school, the North American Global Priory plan for the North American Continental Council and in articulating the pressure points for Europe, releasing a vision of directions for Quarters III and IV. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building the advance calendar and assignments that allow for a smooth and powerful start up in Quarter III.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that Chicago sends out Management treks to Kingston, Latin America Council, Guatemala City, Mexico City and Area Montreal to review grants and coordinate management thrusts of the Americas. First annual *Journal* is sent to the bindery. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining the vision of the long range to allow prioritizing of the many crucial demands.
