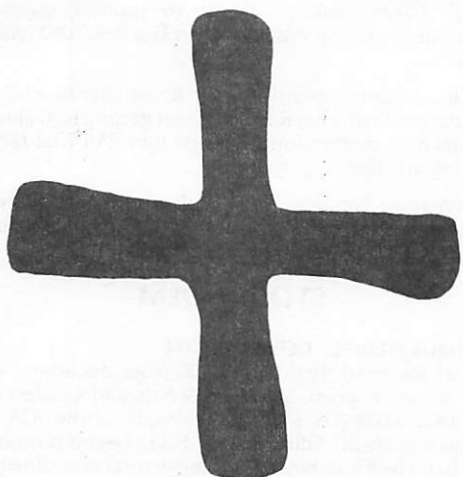


# THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

QUARTER IV WEEK ONE

April 5-11, 1982



## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Padre Faustino, member of Segovia metro team comes to Madrid for week of successful inking for elders' residence in Navares de Enmedio. ICA: Portugal registration is formalized and Portuguese Board holds first meeting.

Internal: Paul Shrijnen and Helen Williams arrive in Lamego for two weeks of development. Planning for Quarters IV and I in Madrid gives clearer map of focus through summer.

Contradiction: Finding the keystone that activates volunteers. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Implementation meetings in five villages with assignments to do visible signs elicit high enthusiasm from the local people. First "greenhouse" is already completed by one iron man in Mezio. Visit to Minister of Education and Youth in Lisboa nets promise to obtain three yearly salaries for Portuguese volunteers.

Internal: Luz Marina Aponte is received as Intern in the Order during visit of Panchayat; Branca and Jeronima join three young Portuguese men as full-time volunteers; and Fr. Marcel talks with Archbishop and Vicar about structural relationship between ICA and the Church.

Contradiction: Ensuring that ten enduring visible signs in ten villages are celebrated before April 4th. (Wk. 9)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Formation Fortnight recruitment effort results in a list of 12 interested candidates for full or part-time participation. House holds a CS-1 in the presence of two colleagues, immediately involving them with part of the leadership role. There are now 18 paid registrations for the next VOW (Volunteer Orientation Weekend).

Internal: The Charitable trust is 100% ready to be audited and a Catholic bishop of East London considers offering House a convent to live in for the next three years.

*'Listen to my words.

Contradiction: Being only 18 days away from deadline of actual move, without clear alternatives, while the programme load is not decreasing and all are nervously trusting the challenge of an open future. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Sylvia Francis and Jean Taylor return from Area Council and give reports on happenings and extremely busy next three months of the Regions. Jean Taylor leaves for Continental Womens' event in Brussels as regional colleagues anticipate local women's study.

Internal: This week sees beginning of RS-I pedagogy on study night as House sees the need to reground staff in our history — which is still very relevant.

Contradiction: Finding strategic ways to move with power with regional colleagues, whilst taking advantage of new spring momentum. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Three regional families provide scholarship funds to allow new colleagues to participate in Formation Fortnight. A jumble sale is scheduled by Newport core to raise a second scholarship. House team drives to Brussels for weekend on Women in Development.

Internal: Sheila Hickey is sent to Brussel for Formation Fortnight preparation and to broaden French-speaking staff. "Swing into spring" begins with gardening and House polish.

Contradiction: Creating the story for expanded local programme. (Wk. 12)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three men who work in *informatics* (word processing, computer technology) take part in Roundtable which uses reading from *The World Challenge* as reference for discussion. The dialogue continues in two English classes. Art form conversation on a piece of music is the program for fifth monthly English Evening. Desmond Avery does LENS in London with a social service employment agency.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

Internal: Beverly Parker's sixtieth birthday gives colleagues occasion to bring flowers and champagne to reception celebrating the Third Phase, and the next night the House toasts the Fourth Phase in Montmartre before going to another colleague's home for a surprise Vietnamese dinner.

Contradiction: Broadening the horizons of House members at the same time as broadening those of the rest of the Regional Team. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Continental Women's Course is launched with 25 present from Glasgow, London, Bristol/Cardiff, Paris, Amsterdam, Berlin, and Frankfurt with Brussels women's study group and House as faculty, resulting in the demonstration of new methods of researching the Revolutions and the emergence of a self-conscious network of care. Whole House participates in four-day BF 60,000 consultation in Brugge to train Indonesian Government Officials in methods of regional catalysis. *The Third Wave* study completes sixth session with all day forum and celebration.

Internal: House concentrates on recovery of humanness as a team with weekly "going sane" evening studying Dr. Jean Baker Miller's book, *Toward A New Psychology of Women*, and also celebrates Rose Casswell's 28th birthday (cinema and restaurant) as a foursome — the first time House has gone out together.

Contradiction: Discovering that, with an absolute explosion of mission and implosion of spirit, indicies of sociological accountability for mission have disappeared and now need to be discovered for Quarter IV planning. (Wk. 12)\*

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Rolf Lather comes by House to talk about his volunteer experiences in India filled with vitality and excitement over seeing possibilities for the villages of India and the new Indian leadership. Three more say yes to Formation Fortnight as letters and phone calls continue.

Internal: Part-time job search initiated with surprising possibilities as way to fill the gaps while the new strategy of English teaching fills out.

Contradiction: Keeping missional momentum when varied schedules minimize corporate time with the new self-support and Formation Fortnight leadership configurations. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Circuit to Groingena and Amsterdam Metros with sojourner Kees Wiertz results in two more for the Fortnight training in Brussels. Visit with Rotary International Administration Committee brings positive response of support. Visit with Basis Gemeente opens potential for dialogue.

Internal: Week II gives final polish on the newsletter; first visit of the babysitter frees extra Day I time; and Jan Joosten has the House to dinner to plan call for next week.

Contradiction: Seeing new programme "buds" and wondering when the right time is for fertilising and harvesting. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Three from Berlin Regional Team participate in Frankfurt Regional Colloquy and share insights on packaging while marketing programs in English to U.S. military, multi-nationals and international groups.

Internal: The one left at home hosts former volunteer visiting in Berlin and plans for youth training event in Hamburg this Week II.

Contradiction: Standing before long range possibility (from Colloquy) while deciding on next three necessary steps. (Wk. 9)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: *Caritas Italiana* agrees to sponsor seminar for seminarians at a total cost of Italian Lira 2,500,000 (about US \$2,000).

Internal: Joe Dixon spends week in Rome after Panchayat trek and succeeds in touring Rome without getting lost. House fast day ends with celebration including film "*All That Jazz*" and attending art show.

Contradiction: Figuring out a releasing strategy that will enable marketing versus recruitment (of Imaginal Education seminar and Colloquy in particular). (Wk. 9)

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Regional Team writes 20-page document on the Urban Scout Program. *Spejders* (Scouts and Guides) contribute D.Kr. 3,000 (US \$400) to the work of the ICA. Alona Kickbusch in Health Education (W.H.O.) begins promotion of the Urban Health seminar for intersectoral coordination.

Internal: With the arrival of spring, House sweeps clean Area finances and prepares garden for planting.

Contradiction: Allowing this boat to sail through the symplegedes of self-support, finance and missional opportunities. (Wk. 9)

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Eight local colleagues of widely divergent ages and life styles find that Roundtable speaks to their need and forms a basis for intergenerational interchange. Group decides to continue meeting during Quarter IV with first evening's up-front roles and hosting already voluntarily filled.

Internal: Being locked out of the apartment again reminds House that ordinary people on the street care and use creativity in unlocking doors without expecting reimbursement.

Contradiction: Finding strategic ways to engage those who care in catalytic action for the world. (Wk. 12)\*

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

### **ABIDJAN**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: A week of practical methods training for delegates from the Cluster villages begins, stops, then begins again as the participants finally make decision to pay registration fee.

Internal: Another hotel English course brings in additional, much needed, income.

Contradiction: Implementing the necessary plan when foundational elements are shaky. (Wk. 10)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Eastern circuit team does a presentation to 17 leaders of Port Hartcourt Christian Council. New arena for programs is uncovered through research on co-operatives and a meeting with Nigerian Rubber Board managers. Human Development Workshop is scheduled for 26 Lagos State Community Development Officers.

Internal: The opportunity to reflect on current situation in Ghana presents itself while hosting J. A. Harrison from Ghana for the week.

Contradiction: Ensuring people's commitment to take the form of concrete action in doing programs. (Wk. 12)\*

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Diamond of Zambia preschools swell to 411 children as the House prepares to light the fourth fire by launching the fourth preschool. Diamond of Zambia preschool teachers attend "mat making" session in Kapini led by women from Kapini Village Women's Industry. Development team visits all the banks in Lusaka, and the newly opened Citibank donates K 250 immediately. Kapini visibility improves as flowering trees are planted and Air India agrees to donate the expenses of the mural painting on the HDTs walls.

Internal: House celebrates the Ford's return from the garage after four months of disrepair and prepares newsletter for supporters and colleagues in the Region.

Contradiction: Keeping programmatic momentum going in midst of overwhelming possibilities and limited troops. (Wk. 9)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Preparations for next series of cluster consults include xeroxing 4750 pages and collating ten reams of paper. Masii location impact is completed with all 80 villages holding village development meetings and sub-location assemblies.

Internal: In week of celebration and movement, House welcomes Oswaldwa's and Gatum Gosavi as new House members, John Worden finishes three exams, Adam Lingo has fine 11th birthday party and several guests transit through.

Contradiction: Maintaining past quarter's momentum while designing tasks and teams for new quarter. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: South Tiriki holds first location meeting with over 100 people present. Talks are given by the Chief and the District Officer. The third Village Leadership Institute graduates 38 village leaders. Site selection team chooses two new district projects in West Pokot and Trans-Nzoia.

Internal: Section 'A' staff receives new troop Russell Lincoln from Area London one week after assigning Walter Heiges back to his books.

Contradiction: Becoming proficient in doing a location project when there is no rule of thumb. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: Muputi Location (31 villages) solidifies structural engagement with government officers LENS follow-up meeting and meeting of 150 HCT's. Iveti Location (43 villages) reports first quarter actuation includes 29 nursery schools being built, 690 toilets under construction, 1,350 compost pits dug, 1,520 dishracks built and 18,402 trees planted. Twelve of sixteen sub-locations are set up for March impact in Mitaboni and Masii.

Internal: Panchayat team visits Muputi and Iveti Locations. New songs are practised by Kamweleni women to honor the Panchayat, and the completion of two years in the New Village Movement is celebrated by eleven people.

Contradiction: Visiting leaders and villagers to bridge gap of communication, to coordinate increasingly complex village schedule. (Wk. 7)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Norwegian students return for debriefing after visiting Maliwada and Jawale allowing depth reflection and some change in preconceived notions.

Internal: Umakant Singh conducts collegium on Sri Lanka trek revealing openness and immediate programme possibilities.

Contradiction: Maintaining the demonstration ashram through a more effective team mode, amidst an intense circuiting period. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Team paints quotes in the cluster circle villages, using words of Tagore. Karodi dam is inspected after four months effort and two government officials visit to ask the team's learning about small industrial development.

Internal: House creates a curriculum for the staff to learn basic English.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum going in spite of national festivals and busy harvesting season. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Chikhale cluster hosts a continuing stream of Indian and Overseas visitors as part of the IERD. Two teams begin first stage of 40 Gram Sabhas across the Block with a screen to help decide next cluster location. Documentation team completes first round of ten villages. Chikhale village carries out major improvements to the primary school. Two Mahila Mandals collect money and open bank accounts for preschool material.

Internal: House is scattered as teams are assigned to Lonavala IERD meeting, Gram Sabhas, Documentation, Cluster actuation and Imaginal Education courses. House sends large contingent of five Ashram people and five villagers to Pune to celebrate marriage of colleague Vijay Lokhande and Kalpana.

Contradiction: Holding the balance of regional demands and cluster focus. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

External: Government engineer visits Khambale to take measurements for the preschool and signs a certificate for the release of 50 bags of cement.

Internal: Team gets loan from Canara Bank for 20 sheep for Khambala.

Contradiction: Finding a teacher for the preschool. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE**

External: Major milestone on Women's sewing industry is reached — 26 women open bank accounts in Canara Bank. Team receives confirmation of Rs. 20,000 for drinking water scheme for Milje village; two key site visits from Agha Khan Foundation and Kirlosker Cummins happen, and invitations go out for four-sector (HDZ initiation) meeting. A cultural interchange evening is held in the village with Norwegian folk-dancing, American singing and a late night Indian Bajan.

Internal: Norwegian International Cultural Studies Group arrives to stay five days, and Norwegians prepare traditional porridge for *Ashram*. Pip and Helen Hancock arrive from Britain to volunteer. *Ashram* celebrates marriage of Vijay Lokhande to kalpurna in Pune.

Contradiction: Making sure immediate resources and cluster design are focussed on keystones and visibility. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE**

External: Continued push on women's development results in registration numbers for two villages, preschool donations for two villages, and three villages send women to Kolhapur to meet with women's cadre and to market for *chewda* industry. Maale village leaders have first meeting this quarter when BDO (district officer) announces that the Village Development Minister is coming for a site visit with only one day to prepare.

Internal: Mary D'Souza visits and finds a swirl of activity in preparation for the Minister's site visit. John McAdam spends four days in hospital with an infected finger; and the lights come on again when the bill is paid!

Contradiction: Holding tension of saving the breakloose in particular villages and maintaining the rational circuit design of structured cluster work. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA**

External: Youth *mandal* (group) collects Rs. 2,000 and buys a Sivaji statue. House visits the BDO (district Officer) for an authorization letter and details for purchase of toilet materials. Internal: Suresh Patil spends two weeks in Maale on an interchange visit.

Contradiction: Two families have recently left *Nava Gram Prayas*, making the placement of troops very difficult. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM**

External: The bakery reopens with a larger market and new management. The team opens a shop near Gandhi Hospital for selling the bread. Sevagram initiates Maharashtra cluster survey with whole House participating in Nandora survey.

Internal: House celebrates completion of a week of priorship training with the birth of the Borker family baby girl.

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI**

External: *Mahila Mandal* meetings with *Tika* ceremony are held in the three cluster villages. Women's literacy class uses curriculum developed in Sevagram, and women begin to plan a women's centre. Panchayat Semiti completes plan for the Balwadis and Rani Rajkumar Institute in Chandrapur agrees to provide a Montessori teacher for July. ITDP agrees to a 50% subsidy on bullocks, and bore well drilling begins. Ballapur Industries funds Imaginal Education and asks that House put in a proposal for some other projects.

Internal: Collegium on *Ashram* discipline deepens House's wisdom. Ben Chapman goes to Delhi for motor cycle. *Nava Gram Prayas* women celebrate by going to Ballapur to see a film.

Contradiction: Making a realistic practical plan for keystone implementation. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD**

External: CYF is held in Yeshwant College. Everyone enjoys themselves very much. Several professors express desire to work with House more and provide letter of recommendation.

Internal: Tables, chairs, curtains, tubelight, ceiling cloth and new wall decor as well as distemper transform a bare room into an office.

Contradiction: Failing to involve villages in planning. (Wk. 10)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: HDZ cluster leaders offer auxiliary housing after two more *Gram Sabhas*. *Ashram* experiments with new time design and builds four-mouth manoeuvre timeline from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m., thus releasing all to participate.

Internal: Sweaters come off and fans go on as winter finally leaves and temperatures soar 15°F in a week.

Contradiction: Keeping up the speed of the Rajdhani Express, while picking up Regional Team along the way. (Wk. 11)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Week 1 circuit to Vijaywada completes programme circuits to 18 of the 36 metros in Area Madras in six months. ICA now has current programme or programme opportunities in four states and two nations. Idea of doing exchange with Japanese urban community is met with favourable response by Sikh village leaders.

Internal: House is dispersed for the Quarter IV culmination of the programme year, with one sent out to teach in the Global Academy, four sent out to be the Bangalore Outpost, do the village demonstration, harness the four-sector momentum and pull off the HDTI, two sent out to do a Human Development Course, and two sent out to circuit to Vijaywada.

Contradiction: Determining the strategic diamonds when House has been given a whole treasure chest of gems. (Wk. 13)\*

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Imaginal Education course with 25 primary teachers of leading Calcutta girls' school, La Martiniere, is a great event and paves the way for another course in the twin boys' school next week. LENS is confirmed with Lipton Tea. First proposals for Calcutta bustee programmes are written.

Internal: It is a week of oranges with Paula Philbrook arriving Monday to teach Imaginal Education with one cratefull and Development team, John Burbidge and Monu Bhattacharya, arriving Thursday with another cratefull.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time, troops and money to ensure strategic positioning for Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS**

External: Development arrives for Week II signals check and finds plethora of Kuala Lumpur calls interrupting corporate meetings.

Internal: Collegiums and evenings allow catching up on the quarter's events including the Tonga School, Bombay IERD meeting, Area Sydney, Surabaya LENS and Kuala Lumpur Wedge; House experiences both nexus fast and celebration.

Contradiction: The future is blowing wildly in our faces, sometimes brightening the air and sometimes blinding us. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: Dato Seri Radin Soenrano Al Haj, Secretary General, Ministry of Agriculture, decides to take ICA and work with Trengganu under Ministry of Agriculture. He would write a letter to the Ministry of Agriculture to support that project and also request the Minister to write a letter to the Ministry of Home Affairs re: visa extension. New Malaysian Development proposal has been written.

Internal: For first cultural night event, House goes out with Nexus for dinner in Tavian Selera.

Contradiction: Knowing what we can do, while being constantly reminded of what we cannot. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: A new light shines in discovering the emerging movement as preschool district guild (multi-sector) plans Preschool Fair as part of teachers' style training. 700 colleagues are on mailing list of Vol. 1, No. 1, *Sumatera Voice*.

Internal: Management trek with the Hoff's is highlighted by global collegiums and fateful act of finally changing banks.

Contradiction: Insuring clear bookkeeping procedures with the government. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: Fees from P.T. Perkebunan 23 LENS bring in \$12,000, and LP 3 ES LENS set for April 12-14 keeps great momentum in two regions of Java's three regions — 79 participants are in the two P.T.P. 23 LENS. National election begins with two-week limited campaigning across the islands, while House pauses to hear Eunice Shankland's report on North American Panchayat trek and the Bombay IERD/July '82 meeting.

Internal: Getting underway again, as Eunice returns after two months and Sherwood returns from his father's funeral, means grounding Area Fast Day with Order economic conversations, sending Elizabeth Neat to Yogyakarta for weekend Global Language School module, and dealing with assignment proposals for Global Academy and July '82 preparation.

Contradiction: Designing troop configuration to initiate new major village work opportunity, while meeting end-of-month administrative deadlines. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Visits to District Head (*Bupati*) and Assistant Governor confirm the need for House's continued presence. Dates are fixed for LENS with the provincial planning agency. Efforts continue to obtain provincial grant.

Internal: Extended planning session initiates brooding for next quarter. Saturday excursion to an old Dutch fort reminds House of regional history.

Contradiction: Balancing all activities in such a way that a breakloose occurs on all fronts. (Wk. 11)\*

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Integrated circuit takes Operations and Research to Japan to attend national meeting and do LENS recruitment. January ICA reports are completed under new national general ledger system. Week is highlighted with development hosting an Evening at the Institute.

Internal: Fasting Day ends with special feast including an assortment of Japanese delicacies presented to the Nexus by Miss Hiroe Takagi before returning to Tokyo after teaching three years in Hong Kong. She comments, "Even before going to my own home in Tokyo, I am going to visit the ICA!"

Contradiction: Struggling with question of how to claim victory of the year as Quarter IV quickly approaches. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: Village survey reaches one-third completion mark. Nam Wai Foundation Board Chairman announces at Board Meeting that when money comes in, he wants to take Board members to see villages in India.

Internal: House is called to attention over long-range implication of computer technology and necessity for thinking through now the next phase during the study of *The World Challenge*.

Contradiction: Creating Quarter IV plan that will juggle the many competing programs and personnel demands. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG**

External: Two teams are sent to Taipei for LENS marketing, Chinese company development, and recruitment for second HDTI in Taiwan.

Internal: House has planning session for next four month's programs and attends one Chinese colleague's wedding.

Contradiction: Having only two Chinese staff to handle all programs and activities. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Trek to Kaohsiung procures US \$2,500 in developed funds and a LENS follow-up consultation with an ICI subsidiary. Initial probe for an HDTI facility turns up 10 leads.

Internal: Peter Hu's daughter gives birth to her third girl, and John Montgomery receives "encouraging news" about an infant boy available for adoption.

Contradiction: Infusing HDTI construct with sufficient historical power and context while allowing the school to be the vehicle through which future program is informed. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

Contradiction: Retooling formats for Quarter IV to capitalize on new contacts. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Panchayat visit catalyzes large gathering with three Urs present. Chaplain Fred Lamar shows slides of DePauw trek to Azpitia and Dr. Thomas Malone of the Holcomb Research Institute opens the new world of international science contacts for IERD.

Internal: Regional Team member catalyzes movie excursion to see *The French Lieutenant's Woman* followed by conversation at a fine restaurant.

Contradiction: Inventing team configuration and covenant that integrates veterans and apprentices. (Wk. 13)\*

## NEW YORK

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: LENS PSU at Bell Labs for whole department and RS-I at United Methodist Church in Manhattan on same day net \$1,250 program income while loan committee of bank approves loan for construction of Area Training Center.

Internal: Regional Team meeting at end of Area Training Center workday plans Quarter IV while two are sent out for full eight-week Global Academy participation.

Contradiction: Unblocking steps in House construction without money as unblocking technique. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Representatives of five nations and three major world religions gather for an Evening with the Institute at the residence of Anthony and Hilde Betonte in Morgantown, West Virginia. Area Guardians Trek brings to consciousness the Guardian role as Joan Seacord of New York meets Dan and Jane Moore of Huntington, West Virginia. Shrove Tuesday pancake Roundtable impacts lyricist of "We are in a New World Now" with the emerging paradigm.

Internal: Pittsburgh permeators top \$50,000 in self-support income.

Contradiction: Objectifying missional reality to allow structural care for the entire Region. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Ellen Howie returns from Charleston, West Virginia, with exciting report on Community LENS in housing projects. Visit with Institute on Man and Science for serious conversation on Project Documentation. Team distributes 500 brochures for Imaginal Methods workshops — six paid registrations are received.

Internal: Panchayat visit is occasion for colleague gathering, including a Troy physician, George Saxton, who once considered volunteering for 5th City Health Outpost when he taught in Chicago.

Contradiction: Tracking people as well as programs. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Margueritte Nock CS-III graduate and Black Engagement Strategy follow-up participant visits House to discuss possibility of attending HD-I course. In-depth conversation with Allen Poole, Director of City Ventures, reveals comprehensive plans for Industrial Park and extensive revitalization for Parkside area of west Philadelphia. Prior attends Coordinating Council for Human Services that serves eastern section of North Philadelphia where colleague Shirley Smith gives pitch for HD-I.

Internal: House welcomes Ermetra Black upon her return to sojourn after attending Quarter II Global Academy and spending time in Chicago with her family.

Contradiction: Creating for the Regional Team an image that recruiting HD-I is doing formation. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Hope Lutheran Church sponsors Community Forum in Clinton, Maryland, with 50 plus community residents. Regional Strategies Assembly in D.C. concludes Formation Colloquy and welcomes new team members from southern Virginia. Six keystones for next six months are named with five points of each keystone timelined. Bedells host Sir James Lindsay and IERD team with Congressional dinner in their home.

Internal: Richmond Metro celebrates House Church followed by a slide show by Dick Galbreath — Human Relations Commission of Petersburg, Virginia, attend slide show.

Contradiction: Disseminating the model and assignments needed to launch Quarter IV fully. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Week of development makes numerous contacts with religious orders opening new channels for support for global program and Starks Enterprise Corporation. Kelly Michael decides to attend the Global Academy in April-May. David Morton and Wendy Rose head for West Virginia for ten days of Community LENS programs.

Internal: House sends representative to Area workday on New York facility, hosts Development team and variety of other visitors. Spring begins to show.

Contradiction: Facing squarely operational limits (i.e. one Day One troop) in order to uncover healthier modes of planning and action for the future. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Starks Core and regional colleagues rehearse story of movement activity and release new images of possibility in site visit by Campaign for Human Development and dinner and lunch for Panchayat. Wendy keeps House in touch with Maine Community Development Project by attending meeting, visiting other groups and attending a state pension fund conference. Tim aids Mic Mac recognition efforts in midst of high degree of internal politics but awareness of making New England history.

Internal: Wendy reports on participation in West Virginia Community LENS effort; House celebrates Tim's 32nd birthday; and new life emerges (seeds sprout and cat has kittens) while snow relentlessly continues.

Contradiction: Enabling massive work and traditionally hectic quarter to emerge with focus through carefully thought through quarter plan. (Wk. 13)\*

Internal: House welcomes Marguerite returning after a 2-week stay in Saskatchewan for the Regional Consult, Marge arriving for Development and family care, and John Rupert Barnes on his way to the Maritimes.

Contradiction: Engaging in spring breakopen while focusing on effective long-term strategy. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Colleague and executive of fibreglass company arranges Lion Club presentation of LENS methods which enlivens community leadership in Erin and sets stage for cross-sector programme. Mississauga youth attend Saturday pedagogy at House in preparation for two high school events, a Student Planning Council and a Global Issues Symposium. Leadership roles will be filled by students of St. Martin's High School, who were part of the Regional Consult and led their own Youth Forum in November, 1981.

Internal: A week of celebration — champagne breakfast over Bill Edwards' recent work permit, Irish coffee for Bernard's birthday and strawberry chocolate cake for Diane's 16th birthday.

Contradiction: Developing effective implementation and reporting mechanisms that empower the corporate thrust and team participation. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: House presents an Emergent Paradigms Workshop for Futures Group which is impacted with art form and corporate writing format. Second contact with Planetary Initiatives Group raises questions about helpful collaboration.

Internal: House sends Michael to Winnipeg Regional Consult while rest of House completes first floor — that is formation.

Contradiction: Articulating to ourselves and others the unique contribution of ICA to the plethora of group manifestations of the new human consciousness. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX**

External: North Shore Marketing Centre is launched for Atlantic Potential Academy. Mayor Cochrane of Moncton agrees to invite eleven Maritime cities to the Academy and the Northumberland Cooperative sends out invitation to 100 regional colleagues. Contradiction: Turning the whirlwind in the opposite direction to change possibilities into confirmations. (Wk. 11)

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY**

External: The first Mexico City CYF is held with 150 youth representing four different parishes. In preparing for the event 17 people representing seven parishes are trained as CYF orchestrators and the CYF orchestrators manual is translated. The Forum is a tremendous event and opens up three possibilities for other CYF's.

Internal: Melisa Lyn Mathews is baptized by Father Rafael Davila in the parish of San Camilo de Lelis where the ICA is working programmatically with the community. The House also welcomes the Wests, who are in Mexico City to help promote LENS.

Contradiction: Ensuring program continuity on the eve of the departure of four people who must leave the country to renew their visas. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)\*

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Regional Team member goes to Cano Negro to help with training and consult. Canadian Senator Molsen makes site visit to Woburn Lawn and is very impressed as Woburn Lawn is finishing its Industry Complex, the new road to Arnully and the co-op coffee farm. All Cluster villages hold assemblies after Cluster Leadership Seminar. ICA conducts one-day workshop for 50 community and youth leaders from throughout St. Thomas focused on Community Centre programme of Ministry of Youth and Community Development. LENS marketing is stepped up with addition of Jim Kelly, and Xerox says yes to a LENS. Cabinet Minister requests special three-village consult in his constituency.

Internal: House implements programme of Upgrading Domestic Infrastructure by fixing drains, painting blackboard and picking up five inkind tyres.

Contradiction: Keeping pace and getting ahead when the victories have far outstripped the strategies. (Wk. 12)\*

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Daily life is transformed with the coming of 24-hour electricity to Azpitia. Electrical Commission does house-to-house visitation to set up payment system. Sector leadership meets to decide future work project emphasis. Intense training in Community Forum leadership includes six new members on the team. Auxiliary clarifies key maneuvers for Azpitia. Health care-taker training involves 47 people in five communities beyond Azpitia.

Internal: Intense focus on accounting systems work wraps up 1981 in time for report to the government, and IERD preparation work is launched with report to the House on the Lonavala meeting.

Contradiction: Finding ways to strategically work within existing community structures when it is easier to go around them and create others. (Wk. 11)\*

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Second Human Development Methods Lab begins with 35 full-time participants from 12 villages to be represented in the upcoming Cluster Consult. Over US \$3,000 of inkind is picked up with much more to come. Dr. Lara's 70th birthday is celebrated at businessmen's guild meeting.

Internal: Norris Ladely arrives from Jamaica for school and Cluster Consult; Alex Featherstone is sent out after three-month sojourn; and three return safely from four-hour adventure of a stuck truck in a river in the middle of the jungle.

Contradiction: Learning to render into powerful tactics what is available and what is necessary. (Wk. 10)

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: A great celebration held at *Panaderia* (bakery) Saturday night says "Muchas Gracias" to past *Equipo*, "Bienvenido" to newly elected *Directiva* and "Adios" to Area Trek Team as they head East for 12 days to Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay.

Internal: Roundtable is a truly global event as all are introduced anew to China and seven guests speak three different languages, Spanish, Japanese and Subwano. A. Tonosaki and E. Vegara, from Area Rio de Janeiro spiritize House with presence, stories and collegium.

Contradiction: Recognizing transition as a new set of struggles and an ambiguous avenue of creativity. (Wk. 13)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Bracana meeting, with 80 participants, reviews plan for Community Planning Series. Thirty invitations to Human Development course are delivered to Rio Bonito structures. Tonosaki visits top executives from eight Japanese corporations on the first Sao Paulo circuit in years and stays in inkind room at Hilton. Completed 1981 financial report shows House debt-free for the first time.

Internal: Ed Vergara and Tonosaki depart on visa renewal trip to Chile, and David Thomas from Seattle arrives on his Latin American tour.

Contradiction: Putting together Human Development course without losing continuity of preparation for Bracana/Tatus Community Planning Series. (Wk. 11)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that Sir James Lindsay visits the Development Centrum Chicago at the conclusion of his North American Trek during which Andrew and Jean Young and Robert McNamara add their names to the Global Advisory Board for the IERD. Extraordinary maneuvers are planned to guarantee one million dollars (\$1 million) over the next four months. Operations and Development meet together to coordinate program and funding efforts. The key contradiction lies in the arena of looking through July to guarantee the one million dollar bottom line.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports from Bombay that HDZ Practicum is completed in Sevagram, Maliwada and Maale Clusters. The 35th Global Academy has eight additional participants in RS-I over Easter weekend while the Chicago Nexus celebrates Good Friday with the 14 Stations of the Cross. University Symposium task force launches recruitment drive, firms up facility in Indianapolis and designs interview format. Taking one day to design Quarter IV maneuvers in order to envision practical ways to get whole job done. The key contradiction lies in the arena of building eventfulness that allows protracted campaigns to win.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the two extended circuits to Calcutta and Bangalore, including course set up and teaching, and attending the Area Councils, enable the major events of Quarter IV — the HDTI and the Methods Academy. The three great mountains — the LENS Facilitator's Manual revision, the North American Quarter III Program Summary, and the North American Quarter IV Program Assignments are completed and ready for publishing. Upon tabulating repository of Actuation models and methods, Centrum is astounded at the wealth of common memory. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding the ways to allow the repository to work effectively and therefore speed the work of actuation by building on past work.

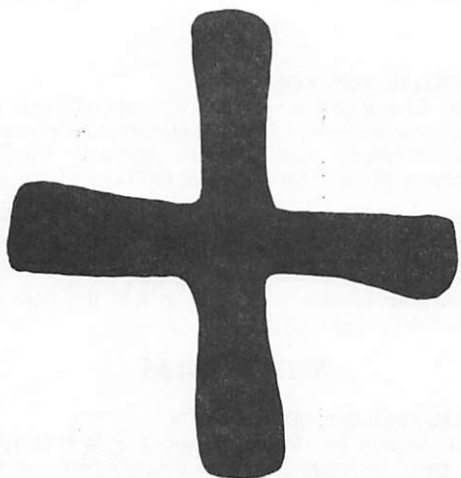
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: *Caja de Ahorros* (Spain's largest network of savings and loan associations) says "yes" to a demonstration LENS for regional directors of social work. Several professional entertainers say "yes" to performing at Boceguillas fiesta to initiate their new village association and cultural centre.

Internal: International company asks Pat Allen to return as English teacher at \$500 per month for 3 hours a day, significantly improving self-support outlook.

Contradiction: Implementing all systems for April-May LENS blitz in midst of finalizing positive decisions from "fence-sitters". (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Implementation meetings in five villages with assignments to do visible signs elicit high enthusiasm from the local people. First "greenhouse" is already completed by one iron man in Mezio. Visit to Minister of Education and Youth in Lisboa nets promise to obtain three yearly salaries for Portuguese volunteers.

Internal: Luz Marina Aponte is received as Intern in the Order during visit of Panchayat; Branca and Jeronima join three young Portuguese men as full-time volunteers; and Fr. Marcel talks with Archbishop and Vicar about structural relationship between ICA and the Church.

Contradiction: Ensuring that ten enduring visible signs in ten villages are celebrated before April 4th. (Wk. 9)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Formation Fortnight recruitment effort results in a list of 12 interested candidates for full or part-time participation. House holds a CS-I in the presence of two colleagues, immediately involving them with part of the leadership role. There are now 18 paid registrations for the next VOW (Volunteer Orientation Weekend).

*The word of the LORD came to me: 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you for my own; before you were born I consecrated you, I appointed you a prophet to the nations.' 'Ah! Lord God,' I answered, 'I do not know how to speak; I am only a child.' Internal: The Charitable trust is 100% ready to be audited, and a Catholic bishop of East London considers offering House a convent to live in for the next three years.

Contradiction: Being only 18 days away from deadline of actual move, without clear alternatives, while the programme load is not decreasing and all are nervously trusting the challenge of an open future. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Team discovers future colleague with visit to Director of Industrial Society — Scotland. Two-hour visit culminates in invitation to luncheon to hear John Garnet speak and date is set for demonstration LENS for ten staff of Industrial Society. Team does further contexting on volunteer service programme with visit to 4 staff of Strathclyde University Careers Office.

Internal: House is impacted by the film "Reds". Conversation reveals our inadequate historical background and the fact that revolutions do not always go the way intended.

Contradiction: Imaging broad picture for next year through two weeks of House dispersment. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: First LENS marketing visit in Region lands yes for LENS in May with Fullempley Trust (private training scheme with focus on black youth). Newport Regional Team holds jumble sale to raise scholarship for Formation Fortnight.

Internal: Joan Weeks cooks great House Church feast during second visit this quarter.

Contradiction: Clarifying House's ongoing role with local groups. (Wk. 13)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two-week visit from Linda Barret reinvigorates development in France. Colleague lends car for trek to southern France. First day-long English intensive in the House thoroughly teaches art form method to two persons and shows what is needed for next three intensives in May and June.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

Internal: Sojourner joins Team for two weeks, translating IERD material and representing France at Women's PSU in Brussels.

Contradiction: Exploiting integrating activities of the House (especially Roundtable, France collegiums and Chardin studies) over against the sense of fragmentation and helplessness in society. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Continental Women's Course is launched with 25 present from Glasgow, London, Bristol/Cardiff, Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, and Frankfurt with Brussels women's study group and House as faculty, resulting in the demonstration of new methods of researching the Revolutions and the emergence of a self-conscious network of care. Whole House participates in four-day BF 60,000 consultation in Brugge to train Indonesian Government Officials in methods of regional catalysis. *The Third Wave* study completes sixth session with all day forum and celebration.

Internal: House concentrates on recovery of humanness as a team with weekly "going sane" evening studying Dr. Jean Baker Miller's book, *Toward A New Psychology of Women*, and celebrates Rose Casswell's 28th birthday (cinema and restaurant) as foursome—first time House goes out together.

Contradiction: Discovering that, with an absolute explosion of mission and implosion of spirit, indicies of sociological accountability for mission have disappeared and now need to be discovered for Quarter IV planning. (Wk. 12)\*

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Formation Fortnight recruitment enters final phase — 15 confirmed participants from the Area (five from the Region) while several more members of the Regional Team are trying to schedule their participation. ICA registers as a participant in a coalition of Womens Groups in Frankfurt. The first scheduled event is one-day exhibition on the role of women.

Internal: A week of interchange happens as the Stringhams host James Stringham on round-the-world trip while rest of House travels to Brussels for the Womens Conference and Fortnight preparation.

Contradiction: Working out how to move comprehensively on the whole mission in the midst of emphasizing immediate self-support needs and mid-range self-support possibilities. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Development circuit to Koln Region visits 14 religious orders and brings home 1,000 DM. Volunteer issues punctuate week with Keese Wiertz sent out to Lamego, with pre-post volunteer evaluations, receipt of glowing letter from India, and volunteer inquiries coming in by phone.

Internal: Colleague invites House over to dinner and volunteers to babysit while House goes to movie; and first six-page newsletter is mailed.

Contradiction: Expressing the yes to continental needs in midst of honoring and enabling new regional liveliness. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Three from Berlin Regional Team participate in Frankfurt Regional Colloquy and share insights on packaging while marketing programs in English to U.S. military, multi-nationals and international groups.

Internal: One left home hosts former volunteer visiting in Berlin and plans for youth training event in Hamburg.

Contradiction: Standing before long-range possibility (from Colloquy) while deciding next three necessary steps. (Wk. 9)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: Several calls are made on several *Collegio* to recruit for seminar sponsored by Caritas Italian. Presentation at Santa Sussana Women's Guild opens contacts for future engagement. Mr. and Mrs. Clark of FAO attend guest night.

Internal: House spends three days doing Quarter IV planning and equips the training centre with newly purchased crockery and tables built by House.

Contradiction: Getting task done in half the time before Easter holidays begin. (Wk. 13)\*

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Section for Health Promotion at W.H.O. requests ICA proposal for intersectoral coordination be re-written for health promotion across urban Europe and suggests they assist with recruitment and funding. Fourteen attend open house event. Marianne Baasch gives a dinner to celebrate her having raised all the money for travel and attendance to the Brussels Fortnight.

Internal: Phase I attends World Ice Skating Finals in Copenhagen with invitation from the Danish host committee.

Contradiction: Uncovering funding possibilities to launch urban seminar. (Wk. 13)\*

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Recruitment for Formation Fortnight takes an exciting turn when one metro colleague recruits seven persons to the LENS portion of the Fortnight. A meeting with 3 course grads again demonstrates the ability to immediately use the methods in local situations and creates urgency for further training.

Internal: Other half of House returns from two-week training centre building preparation in Brussels.

Contradiction: Seeing that dealing with minutiae of bureaucratic structures is part of overall mission. (Wk. 13)\*

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

## ABIDJAN

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Training program continues as Regional Team moves to cluster site for expanded training in village meeting methods in preparation for launching new clusters. Nelson goes to Ghana to do series of village meetings.

Internal: Jean-Claude Kouadio is received as an intern — the first Ivorian intern.

Contradiction: Training new people fast enough to keep up with missional thrust. (Wk. 12)\*

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: NICA presentation to 52 prominent international women hosted by Swiss Ambassador's wife opens several program possibilities. Joint venture W.H.O./N.I.C.A. village health forum is set up for Araromi village in Badagary local government area for April 5th. Northern circuit uncovers several programme opportunities with government, religious orders, and businesses.

Internal: House hosts Christian Health Association staff for a week, and week is highlighted by a picnic in the rain at the pool and C.H.A.N. receiving visa quota for three.

External: On multiple site visit at the same time, Zambia Airways, U.S. Embassy and *National Mirror* newspaper are impacted by preschool programme in Diamond of Zambia and high visibility of Kapini. Air India completes Regional Training Centre symbols on the walls. Lions Club visits Kapini to announce 1000-patient health camp for D.O.Z.; and District Headquarters extends mobile health facility. Lyn Mathews, Marian Bassham and the Parekhs symbolically touch soil of Zimbabwe in Area Johannesburg. Board holds their monthly meeting at the House; and Bleadon-Castro team is sent out after six-month sojourn.

Internal: House studies sphere south and comes up with symbol for Area Kinshasa during Roundtable. House hosts Mavis L. Muyunda, M.P. and U.S. Embassy representatives at a dinner in-Kapini HDP.

Contradiction: Building a practical plan that includes new troop configuration to ensure immediate funding, preschool initiation, village industries, and long-range programme support. (Wk. 11)\*

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Quarter III ends with 120 new villages initiated through Human Development Project, cluster and impact consults. Sarova Hotels launch fundraising for Mugumoini Community Center with posters, T-shirts and batiks. Health team receives new manuals and completes another projects health caretakers training.

Internal: House celebrates week of internal planning including Quarter III accomplishments evaluation and the creation of internal designs and assignments for Quarter IV (special emphasis on AALD and third-year journey model) by claiming promises for the future over a particularly delicious dinner.

Contradiction: Finding ways to honor and actuate the myriad of day-to-day claims in light of '81-82 priorities. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: South Tiriki holds first location meeting with over 100 people present. Talks are given by the Chief and the District Officer. The third Village Leadership Institute graduates 38 village leaders. Site selection team chooses two new district projects in West Pokot and Trans-Nzoia.

Internal: Section 'A' staff receives new troop Russell Lincoln from Area London one week after assigning Walter Heiges back to his books.

Contradiction: Becoming proficient in doing a location project when there is no rule of thumb. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: House is completely involved in setting up the Kandani Sub-Location Cluster Consult which starts on Monday.

Internal: House is bolstered to 22 people with many new arrivals. Two full days are spent doing intensive circuit training for old circuiters and new people alike.

Contradiction: Organizing the system which enables House to deal effectively with a congested timeline. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

Contradiction: Correlating programme demands with the new quarter's givenesses. (Wk. 1)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Maliwada Cluster document and chart are finally printed. The 9 Programme Chart mural is now in seven of the eight cluster villages. Third village forestry meeting is set up to implement programmes.

Internal: Great Hindu New Year celebration is marked with Roundtable. House has deep struggle over 25% medical deduction from stipend.

Contradiction: Finding the content to break through memories of Dairy Society failure. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Chikhale cluster hosts a continuing stream of Indian and Overseas visitors as part of the IERD. Two teams begin first stage of 40 *Gram Sabhas* across the Block with a screen to help decide next cluster location. Documentation team completes first round of ten villages. Chikhale village carries out major improvements to the primary school. Two Mahila Mandals collect money and open bank accounts for preschool material.

Internal: House is scattered as teams are assigned to Lonavala IERD meeting, *Gram Sabhas*, Documentation, Cluster actuation and Imaginal Education courses. House sends large contingent of five *Ashram* people and five villagers to Pune to celebrate marriage of colleague Vijay Lokhande and Kalpana.

Contradiction: Holding the balance of regional demands and cluster focus. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

External: Government engineer visits Khambale to take measurements for the preschool and signs a certificate for the release of 50 bags of cement.

Internal: Team gets loan from Canara Bank for 20 sheep for Khambala.

Contradiction: Finding a teacher for the preschool. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE**

External: Major milestone on Women's sewing industry is reached — 26 women open bank accounts in Canara Bank. Team receives confirmation of Rs. 20,000 for drinking water scheme for Milje village; two key site visits from Agha Khan Foundation and Kirlosker Cummins happen, and invitations go out for four-sector (HDZ initiation) meeting. A cultural interchange evening is held in the village with Norwegian folk-dancing, American singing and a late night Indian Bajan.

Internal: Norwegian International Cultural Studies Group arrives to stay five days, and Norwegians prepare traditional porridge for *Ashram*. Pip and Helen Hancock arrive from Britain to volunteer. *Ashram* celebrates marriage of Vijay Lokhande to kalpurna in Pune.

Contradiction: Making sure immediate resources and cluster design are focussed on keystones and visibility. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE**

External: Continued push on women's development results in registration numbers for two villages, preschool donations for two villages, and three villages send women to Kolhapur to meet with women's cadre and to market for *chewda* industry. Maale village leaders have first meeting this quarter when BDO (district officer) announces that the Village Development Minister is coming for a site visit with only one day to prepare.

Internal: Mary D'Souza visits and finds a swirl of activity in preparation for the Minister's site visit. John McAdam spends four days in hospital with an infected finger; and the lights come on again when the bill is paid!

Contradiction: Holding tension of saving the breakloose in particular villages and maintaining the rational circuit design of structured cluster work. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA**

External: Youth *mandal* (group) collects Rs. 2,000 and buys a Sivaji statue. House visits the BDO (district Officer) for an authorization letter and details for purchase of toilet materials.

Internal: Suresh Patil spends two weeks in Maale on an interchange visit.

Contradiction: Two families have recently left *Nava Gram Prayas*, making placement of troops very difficult. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM**

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI**

External: *Mahila Mandal* meetings with *Tika* ceremony are held in the three cluster villages. Women's literacy class uses curriculum developed in Sevagram, and women begin to plan a women's centre. Panchayat Semiti completes plan for the Balwadis and Rani Rajkumar Institute in Chandrapur agrees to provide a Montessori teacher for July. ITDP agrees to a 50% subsidy on bullocks, and bore well drilling begins. Ballapur Industries funds Imaginal Education and asks that House put in a proposal for some other projects.

Internal: Collegium on *Ashram* discipline deepens House's wisdom. Ben Chapman goes to Delhi for motor cycle. *Nava Gram Prayas* women celebrate by going to Ballapur to see a film.

Contradiction: Making a realistic practical plan for keystone implementation. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD**

External: CYF is held in Yeshwant College. Everyone enjoys themselves very much. Several professors express desire to work with House more and provide letter of recommendation.

Internal: Tables, chairs, curtains, tubelight, ceiling cloth and new wall decor as well as distemper transform a bare room into an office.

Contradiction: Failing to involve villages in planning. (Wk. 10)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: HDZ team takes up residence in new cluster and visits all 5 villages. Asaram and Geeta Bhojar embark upon Ghaziabad inkind blitz for medicine for Sikror Health Clinic. Agricultural consultancy to new cluster opens with offers of help and advice from the Indian Agricultural Research Institute and a freelance consultant from Faridabad.

Internal: Whole house celebrates weekly ritual at new cluster outpost as team is augmented by Kevin Boivin and Umakant Singh from Nexus.

Contradiction: Discerning appropriate modes of operation in midst of busy harvesting season. (Wk. 13)\*

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Human Development Course in Anantapur Metro with 34 social workers is a stunning success, with three HDTI participants, requests for future programme, and written statements of support for the HDC programme from 20 social workers. Circuit to Vijaywada Region results in two days of escorted trips to futuristic village development schemes, for possible inclusion in IERD practicum. Letter from Kerala Educational Research Centre for August Imaginal Education Course, represents first programme request from Trivandrum (Cochin) Metro in eight years.

External: Framing team builds maneuvers for next six weeks to systems through the elections. International Computer Ltd. LENS is held in Kuala Lumpur.

Internal: Nexus and House send out Geoff Nixon with Chinese dinner and welcome Robert Lingafelter back from Research trek with Australian wine.

Contradiction: Raising the bottom lines to meet the projected budget for April — June, 1982. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: ICL LENS is held in Genting Highland, Kuala Lumpur, with nine participants of the managerial level. The Wedge-Development team visits with Tun Ku Imran from Antah Holding Company and Tun Sri Henri Lee from D & C Bank. Then Tun Tan Siew Sin is re-visited to request money.

Internal: House sends Cathy Welch for Area Prior check-signals meeting in Jakarta, while Fumiyo Tabira goes to Bontoa Project in Ujung Pandang Region, Indonesia.

Contradiction: Waiting for a positive indication from the Ministry of Home Affairs and Agriculture Ministry to start new quarter plan. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: A new light shines in discovering the emerging movement as preschool district guild (multi-sector) plans Preschool Fair as part of teachers' style training. 700 colleagues are on mailing list of Vol. 1, No. 1, Sumatera Voice.

Internal: Management trek with the Hoffis is highlighted by global collegiums and fateful act of finally changing banks.

Contradiction: Insuring clear bookkeeping procedures with the government. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: Fees from P.T. Perkebunan 23 LENS bring in \$12,000, and LP 3 ES LENS set for April 12-14 keeps great momentum in two regions of Java's three regions — 79 participants are in the two P.T.P. 23 LENS. National election begins with two-week limited campaigning across the islands, while House pauses to hear Eunice Shankland's report on North American Panchayat trek and the Bombay IERD/July '82 meeting.

Contradiction: Balancing all activities in such a way that a breakloose occurs on all fronts. (Wk. 11)

Contradiction: Creating Quarter IV plan that will juggle the many competing programs and personnel demands. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG**

External: Two teams are sent to Taipei for LENS marketing, Chinese company development, and recruitment for second HDTI in Taiwan.

Internal: House has planning session for next four month's programs and attends one Chinese colleague's wedding.

Contradiction: Having only two Chinese staff to handle all programs and activities. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

Sewing Industry receives Gaisano order for 200 electric fan covers, and 18 sewing workers put up capital of 100 each to buy more materials. Mountain Cluster Preschool teachers participate in 45th anniversary of Davao. Langub Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting with 42 pesos store gain.

Internal: House has workdays and applies Bagrass fertilizer.

Contradiction: Securing more vegetable seedlings and fruit trees in Bureau of Forest Industry for Demonstration Farm. (Wk. 10)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: A whirlwind Integrated Circuit from Nexus comes and goes experiencing the liveliness of Tokyo Region — A 50-person eight-hour Town Meeting in Shimoda, a mini ES-I with the Regional Team, two days of documentation of The Japan Strategy and The Tokyo Training Center, a three-day National Task Force Meeting, interviews with Buddhist priests, and reports from Don on the IERD Bombay meeting and the Sri Lanka circuit.

Internal: Regional Team "Vocational Journey" Retreat is a "Getting to know you" event as staff and colleagues focus on individual Vocational Journeys with corporate reflections.

Contradiction: Building the plan that maintains LENS recruitment momentum and gives shape to Formation Events Strategies. (Wk. 13)\*

Contradiction: Creating for the Regional Team an image that recruiting HD-I is doing formation. (Wk. 12)

Internal: Melisa Lyn Mathews is baptized by Father Rafael Davila in the parish of San Camilo de Lelis where the ICA is working programmatically with the community. The House also welcomes the Wests, who are in Mexico City to help promote LENS.

Contradiction: Ensuring program continuity on the eve of the departure of four people who must leave the country to renew their visas. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Fifty attend Cluster Leaders Meeting in Woburn Lawn by walking; and 15 village leaders attend one-day orientation on Order internship; seven people are accepted, five men and two women, after two conversations. ICA Board meets to discuss wide range of issues. Cluster VOICE is distributed. School of Drama sends a director to live in Cluster for two months developing a Theatre Piece on village development; he is from Guyana. Contradiction: Moving boldly on all fronts, trusting that logistics will be provided by virtue of previously launched strategies. (Wk. 13)\*

### **LIMA**

Internal: Caracas House sees the shape of the new order of Those Who Care with Jon Jenkins, Chicago, Jim Newkirk, Chile, Norris Ladely, Jamaica, and nine Caracas colleagues and 30 Barloventanians filling the patio every night during the Consult with singing and stories.

Contradiction: Building the forms of glue that support the gathered and scattered dynamics of the new Venezuelan Movement in a time of intensive actuation. (Wk. 1)\*

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

Internal: Area trek team returns from 3,200 mile loop through Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay with wild stories, great list of new contacts, and huge appetites after miscalculating the cost of return bus tickets.

Contradiction: Finding a means to limit expanding universe of possibilities without screening out the necessary deed. (Wk. 13)\*

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Purchase of a used Jeep (1951 Willys) is highlight of the week and means that House can now reach cluster area in any weather. Development brings in \$1,700. Second weekly meeting is held in Bracana Area in preparation for Community Planning Series.

Internal: Kit and Margaret Krauss celebrate 10th wedding anniversary with a "night on the town" in Rio.

Contradiction: Thinking through practices of the Community Planning Series to ensure great event. (Wk. 12)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that ESSO, Sydney contributes for third year in a row with gift of \$3,400 (USD); Bombay has Rs. 39,550 in hand; and in Chicago the North American Guardians Consult focuses on the guild dynamic. Pioneer Seed tells ICA they want to work with the Midcrest HDZ and backs it up with a \$30,000 check and offers to involve other organizations. Malaysia and Australia create \$300,000 in special maneuver bottom lines. The key contradiction lies in the arena of generating maximum effectivity in order to reach year's bottom line.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Research is on the road with a trek through Area Sydney. The Bombay Area Council and Jawale Cluster Documentation blitz force a fourth revision in a crowded Quarter IV timeline. The first draft is written on the six Maharashtra HDZ Practicums. Area Sydney trek unveils clues to launching regionally-based research activity. The key contradiction lies in the arena of establishing a basic continuum systems dynamic in the midst of "multifarious burgeoning" demands on Research.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that reports from Area Sydney, Area Bombay and the North American Areas (via guardians, R.E.P. Houses and North American Priors) inform the edge of centrum work. Quarter IV planning accelerates journey into Quarter IV. Regional support takes on new edge through cross-centrum efforts and other integrated systems including computerized data processing. The key contradiction lies in the arena of loose corporate accountability in relation to weekly plans.

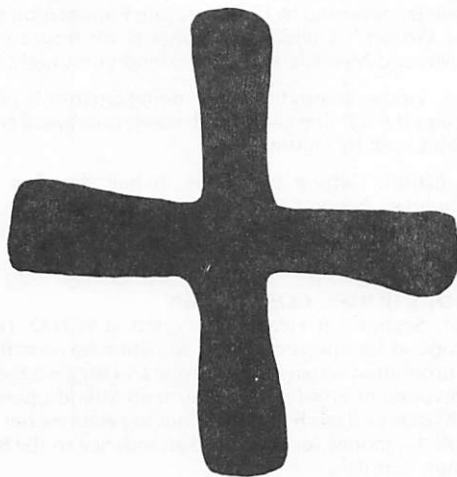
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Caja de Ahorros (Spain's largest network of savings and loan associations) says "yes" to a demonstration LENS for regional directors of social work. Several professional entertainers say "yes" to performing at Boceguillas fiesta to initiate their new village association and cultural centre.

Internal: International company asks Pat Allen to return as English teacher at \$500 per month for 3 hours a day, significantly improving self-support outlook.

Contradiction: Implementing all systems for April-May LENS blitz in midst of finalizing positive decisions from "fence-sitters". (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Implementation meetings in five villages with assignments to do visible signs elicit high enthusiasm from the local people. First "greenhouse" is already completed by one iron man in Mezio. Visit to Minister of Education and Youth in Lisboa nets promise to obtain three yearly salaries for Portuguese volunteers.

Internal: Luz Marina Aponte is received as Intern in the Order during visit of Panchayat; Branca and Jeronima join three young Portuguese men as full-time volunteers; and Fr. Marcel talks with Archbishop and Vicar about structural relationship between ICA and the Church.

Contradiction: Ensuring that ten enduring visible signs in ten villages are celebrated before April 4th. (Wk. 9)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Volunteers (ready-to-go as well as already returned) are in Brussels for the Formation Fortnight. Scholarship funds from concerned colleagues help them on their way.

Internal: An independent judge selects Suyin and Amara as winners in Easter bonnet parade marking joy and surprise of the season. House packing blitz during Easter turns thinking toward immediate future.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: As part of Glasgow framing development, visits are made to two key contacts, given by YMCA colleague, the Director of Strathclyde Regional Council Department of Social Work and the Head of Glasgow Council on Voluntary Services.

Internal: House is sent out for two weeks with celebrative feast around Meditation exercises, the film *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and then a symbolic Maundy Thursday breakfast as individuals go to Cardiff, Brussels and Newcastle for discontinuity and the Formation Fortnight.

Contradiction: Firming up position for next year without losing hold of priorities or making ungrounded promises. (Wk. 1)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Holy Week observances include largest Lenten House group study attendance and participation in local church celebration. Easter is marked with egg dying, hunt, and picnic by the shore.

Internal: House experiences week of comings and goings with arrival of Anne-Marie Murphy and friend Yasmin Khan, plus Emma Francis for Easter break, while Maxine is sent to Brussels for ES-I.

Contradiction: Keeping the irons hot during imposed discontinuity. (Wk. 1)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two-week visit from Linda Barret reinvigorates development in France. Colleague lends car for trek to southern France. First day-long English intensive in the House thoroughly teaches art form method to two persons and shows what is needed for next three intensives in May and June.

Internal: Sojourner joins Team for two weeks, translating IERD material and representing France at Women's PSU in Brussels.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

Contradiction: Exploiting integrating activities of the House (especially Roundtable, France collegiums and Chardin studies) over against the sense of fragmentation and helplessness in society. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Continental Women's Course is launched with 25 present from Glasgow, London, Bristol/Cardiff, Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, and Frankfurt with Brussels women's study group and House as faculty, resulting in the demonstration of new methods of researching the Revolutions and the emergence of a self-conscious network of care. Whole House participates in four-day BF 60,000 consultation in Brugge to train Indonesian Government Officials in methods of regional catalysis. *The Third Wave* study completes sixth session with all day forum and celebration.

Internal: House concentrates on recovery of humanness as a team with weekly "going sane" evening studying Dr. Jean Baker Miller's book, *Toward A New Psychology of Women*, and celebrates Rose Casswell's 28th birthday (cinema and restaurant) as foursome—first time House goes out together.

Contradiction: Discovering that, with an absolute explosion of mission and implosion of spirit, indicies of sociological accountability for mission have disappeared and now need to be discovered for Quarter IV planning. (Wk. 12)

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Team experiences final week of confirming Formation Fortnight participants as both John Stringham and Jon Considine go to Brussels as staff.

Internal: Holy Week is marked by Wednesday evening Maundy Thursday celebration which includes a regrounding of *"The Christ Of History"* by JWM. Wendell St. John is here for a conference on learning styles. Regional Team members pitch in by helping with translation and grounds-keeping while rest of House participates in a resettlement move.

Contradiction: Balancing internal and external thrusts at a time when fiscal solvency is of utmost necessity and the initiation of '82-83 rhythm is critical. (Wk. 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Visit by Paige Cousineau enables House to contact seven agencies that care for need of women and society, and her visit creates openings for collaboration on a number of vistas. Planning workshop is held with colleague to begin count-down toward Imaginal Methods course in week 7. Four potential volunteers contact House, and two come by for 4-hour orientation session.

Internal: House gears up for another round of being dispersed with a short check-signals meeting after Roger returns from permeation trip to Somalia. Kate is sent out to the Fortnight in Brussels.

Contradiction: Creating the consensus that supports the Region, while in a state of radical dispersal. (Wk. 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Three from Berlin Regional Team participate in Frankfurt Regional Colloquy and share insights on packaging while marketing programs in English to U.S. military, multi-nationals and international groups.

Internal: One left home hosts former volunteer visiting in Berlin and plans for youth training event in Hamburg.

Contradiction: Standing before long-range possibility (from Colloquy) while deciding next three necessary steps. (Wk. 9)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: Several calls are made on several *Collegio* to recruit for seminar sponsored by Caritas Italian. Presentation at Santa Sussana Women's Guild opens contacts for future engagement. Mr. and Mrs. Clark of FAO attend guest night.

Internal: House spends three days doing Quarter IV planning and equips the training centre with newly purchased crockery and tables built by House.

Contradiction: Getting task done in half the time before Easter holidays begin. (Wk. 13)

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Section for Health Promotion at W.H.O. requests ICA proposal for intersectoral coordination be re-written for health promotion across urban Europe and suggests they assist with recruitment and funding. Fourteen attend open house event. Marianne Baasch gives a dinner to celebrate her having raised all the money for travel and attendance to the Brussels Formation Fortnight.

Internal: Phase I attends the World Ice Skating Finals in Copenhagen with invitation from the Danish host committee.

Contradiction: Uncovering funding possibilities to launch urban seminar. (Wk. 13)

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Registration papers are re-written again, translated and reviewed by local colleagues in preparation for official registration in Austria. Key referral invites House to lunch (in a border town peering into Czechoslovakia) with promises to open up more doors for House in Austrian public sector. Half of House departs for Brussels and Formation Fortnight event.

Internal: Self-support is given boost with "Let George Do It" handyman service initiated in house of newly appointed American Ambassador (one of three ambassadors in Vienna with portfolio of negotiations for troop reduction) netting \$110.00 for one-and-a-half day's work.

Contradiction: Keeping local regional momentum going when half of House keeps disappearing over the horizon. (Wk. 1)\*

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

### **ABIDJAN**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Training program continues as Regional Team moves to cluster site for expanded training in village meeting methods in preparation for launching new clusters. Nelson goes to Ghana to do series of village meetings.

Internal: Jean-Claude Kouadio is received as an intern — the first Ivorian intern.

Contradiction: Training new people fast enough to keep up with missional thrust. (Wk. 12)

**LAGOS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: NICA presentation to 52 prominent international women hosted by Swiss Ambassador's wife opens several program possibilities. Joint venture W.H.O./N.I.C.A. village health forum is set up for Araromi village in Badagary local government area for April 5th. Northern circuit uncovers several programme opportunities with government, religious orders, and businesses.

Internal: House hosts Christian Health Association staff for a week, and week is highlighted by a picnic in the rain at the pool and C.H.A.N. receiving visa quota for three.

Contradiction: Pushing new opportunities to concrete advantage instead of being overwhelmed by them. (Wk. 12)

**KINSHASA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

External: On multiple site visit at the same time, Zambia Airways, U.S. Embassy and *National Mirror* newspaper are impacted by preschool programme in Diamond of Zambia and high visibility of Kapini. Air India completes Regional Training Centre symbols on the walls. Lions Club visits Kapini to announce 1000-patient health camp for D.O.Z.; and District Headquarters extends mobile health facility. Lyn Mathews, Marian Bassham and the Parekhs symbolically touch soil of Zimbabwe in Area Johannesburg. Board holds their monthly meeting at the House; and Bleadon-Castro team is sent out after six-month sojourn.

Internal: House studies Sphere South and comes up with symbol for Area Kinshasa during Roundtable. House hosts Mavis L. Muyunda, M.P. and U.S. Embassy representatives at a dinner in Kapini HDP.

Contradiction: Building a practical plan that includes new troop configuration to ensure immediate funding, preschool initiation, village industries, and long-range programme support. (Wk. 11)

**NAIROBI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

External: Ford Foundation gives approval for second grant submission following positive evaluation of House work. Section House meeting coordinates Quarter IV scheduling, staff and thrust.

Internal: Week II Section House meeting feasts entirely on inkind food; Bob White celebrates his 39th birthday, and movie conversation on *Taps* addresses all with how to articulate victory.

Contradiction: Finding ways of releasing all to insure Quarter IV victories. (Wk. 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI**

External: Week becomes spectacular juggling feat with Team doing a Village Leaders Institute and the preparation for a Location Officers Conference while preparing for next week's double consult, doing two sub-location cluster consults simultaneously.

Internal: John Muvasia is welcomed to the ranks of the Global New Village Movement. House sustenance systems begin to function as garden is planted and water catchment completes the whole week working.

Contradiction: Maximizing the power of corporate reflection in the midst of strenuous timeline. (Wk. 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI**

External: Ten circuits visit all Mitabomi villages (47) for DOOP meetings and Village Leadership Institute recruitment. Muputi Sub-Location meetings are postponed by District Commissioner for workday to plant 6000 trees at the same place President Moi did a soil conservation workday two weeks ago. First Muputi-Iveti locations leaders meeting is held in Machakos with 116 attending. They decide to commit themselves to do consults (27 people), circuits (46), Village Leadership Institute teaching (55), Impact (36) and Health circuits (53).

Internal: House hosts Ikuyumi HDP staff as they go to set up consult. All circuit teams return for celebration Saturday, and House sends three to Section House meeting in Nairobi.

Contradiction: Dealing with complexity of all the yes's, knowing there is a no somewhere. (Wk. 1)\*

**BOMBAY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: Mr. Trivedi of ANARDE visits. Continental check-signals meeting sparks the commencement of the quarter.

Internal: House sends out Paula Philbrook to Chicago with guests at Roundtable. House celebrates death anniversary of Vitthu Meshram.

Contradiction: Leaving room to manoeuvre and handle shifts within model that covers exciting demands. (Wk. 2)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA**

External: Maliwada Cluster document and chart are finally printed. The 9 Programme Chart mural is now in seven of the eight cluster villages. Third village forestry meeting is set up to implement programmes.

Internal: Great Hindu New Year celebration is marked with Roundtable. House has deep struggle over 25% medical deduction from stipend.

Contradiction: Finding the content to break through memories of Dairy Society failure. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE**

External: Chikhale cluster hosts a continuing stream of Indian and Overseas visitors as part of the IERD. Two teams begin first stage of 40 *Gram Sabhas* across the Block with a screen to help decide next cluster location. Documentation team completes first round of ten villages. Chikhale village carries out major improvements to the primary school. Two Mahila Mandals collect money and open bank accounts for preschool material.

Internal: House is scattered as teams are assigned to Lonavala IERD meeting, *Gram Sabhas*, Documentation, Cluster action and Imaginal Education courses. House sends large contingent of five *Ashram* people and five villagers to Pune to celebrate marriage of colleague Vijay Lokhande and Kalpana.

Contradiction: Holding the balance of regional demands and cluster focus. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH**

External: Government engineer visits Khambale to take measurements for the preschool and signs a certificate for the release of 50 bags of cement.

Internal: Team gets loan from Canara Bank for 20 sheep for Khambala.

Contradiction: Finding a teacher for the preschool. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE**

External: Major milestone on Women's sewing industry is reached — 26 women open bank accounts in Canara Bank. Team receives confirmation of Rs. 20,000 for drinking water scheme for Milje village; two key site visits from Agha Khan Foundation and Kirlosker Cummins happen, and invitations go out for four-sector (HDZ initiation) meeting. A cultural interchange evening is held in the village with Norwegian folk-dancing, American singing and a late night Indian Bajan.

Internal: Norwegian International Cultural Studies Group arrives to stay five days, and Norwegians prepare traditional porridge for *Ashram*. Pip and Helen Hancock arrive from Britain to volunteer. *Ashram* celebrates marriage of Vijay Lokhande to kalpurna in Pune.

Contradiction: Making sure immediate resources and cluster design are focussed on keystones and visibility. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE**

External: Continued push on women's development results in registration numbers for two villages, preschool donations for two villages, and three villages send women to Kolhapur to meet with women's cadre and to market for *chewda* industry. Maale village leaders have first meeting this quarter when BDO (district officer) announces that the Village Development Minister is coming for a site visit with only one day to prepare.

Internal: Mary D'Souza visits and finds a swirl of activity in preparation for the Minister's site visit. John McAdam spends four days in hospital with an infected finger; and the lights come on again when the bill is paid!

Contradiction: Holding tension of saving the breakloose in particular villages and maintaining the rational circuit design of structured cluster work. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA**

External: Youth *mandal* (group) collects Rs. 2,000 and buys a Sivaji statue. House visits the BDO (district Officer) for an authorization letter and details for purchase of toilet materials.

Internal: Suresh Patil spends two weeks in Maale on an interchange visit.

Contradiction: Two families have recently left *Nava Gram Prayas*, making placement of troops very difficult. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM**

External: The bakery reopens with a larger market and new management. The team opens a shop near Gandhi Hospital for selling the bread. Sevagram initiates Maharashtra cluster survey with whole House participating in Nandora survey.

Internal: House celebrates completion of a week of priorship training with the birth of the Borker family baby girl.

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI**

External: 5500 bricks are inkinded and inkind trucks bring 3000 to Kochi and 2500 to Tembhurwahi for preschool and statue bases, bringing inkind total to 12,000 bricks. Seven cows, 12 bullocks and 17 student bicycles are received from Integrated Tribal Development Project (ITDP). Tulana village donates Rs.200 and four non-cluster villages cooperate to finance Kochi Ambedkar statue. Construction begins on five new houses in Tembhurwahi and road drain pipes are laid in Sirci. Over 25 women participate in Kochi *Haldi Kunka* celebration.

Internal: D. Kolebar is assigned home to celebrate 21st birthday and engagement; Mrs. Maske and Mrs. Bennble are assigned to Sevagram Mahila Mandal Institute, and *Ashram* welcomes Ben Chapman back from Delhi development trip. CDA Economic Manager is special Roundtable guest. The *Ashram* celebrates *Guri Padwar* (Hindu New Year).

Contradiction: Enabling *Ashram* corporateness in the midst of heavy cluster actuation where all staff are out doing external mission. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHABAD**

External: CYF is held in Yeshwant College. Everyone enjoys themselves very much. Several professors express desire to work with House more and provide letter of recommendation.

Internal: Tables, chairs, curtains, tubelight, ceiling cloth and new wall decor as well as distemper transform a bare room into an office.

Contradiction: Failing to involve villages in planning. (Wk. 10)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: HDZ Team takes up residence in new cluster and visits all 5 villages. Asaram and Geeta Bhoyar embark upon Ghaziabad inkind blitz for medicine for Sikror Health Clinic. Agricultural consultancy to new cluster opens with offers of help and advice from the Indian Agricultural Research Institute and a freelance consultant from Faridabad.

Internal: Whole House celebrates weekly ritual at new cluster outpost, as team is augmented by Kevin Boivin and Umakant Singh from Nexus.

Contradiction: Discerning appropriate modes of operation in midst of busy harvesting season. (Wk. 13)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Human Development Course in Anantapur Metro with 34 social workers is a stunning success, with three HDTI participants, requests for future programme, and written statements of support for the HDC programme from 20 social workers. Circuit to Vijaywada Region results in two days of escorted trips to futuristic village development schemes, for possible inclusion in IERD Practicum. Letter from Kerala Educational Research Centre for August Imaginal Education Course represents first programme request from Trivandrum (Cochin) Metro in eight years.

Internal: House again discovers that weakness is strength as three teach and bring off a great HDC — one had never taught the course before, one had never been to the course before, and one had never had any ICA course before.

Contradiction: Allowing dialogue between four-year strategy and the openness in every region to reveal the sociological form and new troops of the emerging movement. (Wk. 13)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: First LENS of quarter with Tata Iron Steel Division is great success, evidenced by participant request for follow-up at close of seminar and requests by Tata management for future training. New inkind typewriter is put to good use to get newsletter and M.A. invitation in the mail. Eight-hour miracle of painting the Park Circus Market is completed by 72 people and capped by core group celebration.

Internal: Finance team arrives to monitor audit preparation, and Ronda is assigned to teach LENS.

Contradiction: Maintaining the perspective of strategy in the midst of programme momentum. (Wk. 1)\*

**SINGAPORE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS**

External: Nexus is on location in Sydney, Melbourne, Jakarta and Medan this week, while those in Kuala Lumpur work through Quarter IV maneuver arenas.

Internal: Week of colds and flu accompanies the monsoon, but does not prevent doing the task.

Contradiction: Imminent elections in Indonesia and Malaysia slow down momentum with public sector LENS and frame. (Wk. 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: ICL LENS is held in Genting Highland, Kuala Lumpur, with nine participants of the managerial level. The Wedge-Development team visits with Tun Ku Imran from Antah Holding Company and Tun Sri Henri Lee from D & C Bank. Then Tun Tan Siew Sin is re-visited to request money.

Internal: House sends Cathy Welch for Area Prior check-signals meeting in Jakarta, while Fumiyo Tabira goes to Bontoa Project in Ujung Pandang Region, Indonesia.

Contradiction: Waiting for a positive indication from the Ministry of Home Affairs and Agriculture Ministry to start new quarter plan. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: Team uses the nation's election timeline to advantage as the *Kecamatan* Coalition celebrates visit of the Vice President to *Kecamatan Tanjung Pura*, complete with their first Malay Cultural Celebration. ICA joins *Bangdes* (Rural Development) as part of their exhibit at Medan Fair, and Quarter IV Saturday "Invitational Advanced Training" maneuver is ballooned. Sixty-four participants from the District Demonstration headmen and village council leadership are deeply engaged in one-day methods training on "How to Lead a Workshop".

Internal: Crack construction team builds E.G. table, and week of celebrations include Reusora's third wedding anniversary, Medan Fair and E.G. trip to swimming pool. Rob is sent to Area Houses meeting with regional Quarter III report.

Contradiction: Getting clear on program models during final month of the election campaign. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: Indonesia Chamber of Commerce Secretary General proposes LENS as part of Chamber training program with Dutch businessmen grant. Team met with Mrs. Abidin, Treasurer ICA: Indonesia and her consultant to set up ICAI financial systems.

Internal: House celebrates Easter with first House Church in three years and Easter egg hunt for the emerging generation and sends out Doug Rettig to the Global Academy with gifts from the East. Quarter IV planning places emphasis on HDZ program webbing along with ICAI systems, long-range permeation, Regional Team action and cash in the bag.

Contradiction: Building necessary revolutionary systems that will enable global and national ICA operations. (Wk. 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Weekly preschool circuits continue in the *kecamatan* in the midst of Region's first LENS in over a year with BAPPENDA, the provincial planning/budgeting agency, a great victory after three months of set-up. Beautiful signboards are painted and posted at sites of *gogorancah* (double rice crop method) demonstration plots in villages of Betang and Lekoala, and consultation date is confirmed with Tonasa Cement Company.

Internal: Remaining troops find inner strength to carry on with both external and internal tasks as majority of House staffs LENS in Ujung Pandang. Team welcomes Fumiyo from Kuala Lumpur for a month's stay with grand tour of Bontoa. ICA trainee Ratna Bintang stands up to do collegium for first time, and English classes are intensified.

Contradiction: Thinking through strategic next steps to sustain momentum of past three quarters in the *kecamatan*. (Wk. 13)\*

**HONG KONG****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Management sends David Elliott to Area Tokyo, and news from Seoul Development circuit reports US\$14,000 from Honam Oil. Site visit to Zamboanaga in Manila Region requests proposal for Australian Development assistance Bureau funds and participation in Mactan training program.

Internal: Internal life is restructured after discontinuity wind-down and year end self-support victory announced. Roundtable study of Americas Challenge marketing package elicits hour-long conversation.

Contradiction: Interpreting ambiguity as a block rather than the gift of creativity. (Wk. 2)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: Quarter IV planning reveals the need to think through next six-month plan. Weekly computer training pays off by successfully entering the 1981 program report into the computer for editing.

Three companies request script and photos for international magazines. Health Minister from India visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Area Priors' trip is highlighted by reports from Hong Kong, Taiwan, India, England and North America. Hosting has its advantages as House takes Japanese guests to a disco.

Contradiction: Coordinating calendar to include new programmes while 30 ongoing HDPs intensify. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Two workdays are set both in San Mriguel and Sudtonggan by the group in Japan. Team is assigned in social and economic programs in the whole MI-24. Twenty-three Purok leaders are trained for future village work.

Internal: House welcomes group from Osaka, Japan, while sending Steve and Fred to Tiwi to meet the Governor and Mayor of Legaspi City. Week is highlighted by Philippine and Japanese cultural event.

Contradiction: Facing many tasks and figuring how to move quickly while training is going on. (Wk. 10)

Mountain Cluster Preschool teachers participate in 45th anniversary of Davao. Langub Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting with 42 pesos store gain.

Internal: House has workdays and applies Bagrass fertilizer.

Contradiction: Securing more vegetable seedlings and fruit trees in Bureau of Forest Industry for Demonstration Farm. (Wk. 10)

### **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: A whirlwind Integrated Circuit from Nexus comes and goes experiencing the liveliness of Tokyo Region — A 50-person eight-hour Town Meeting in Shimoda, a mini ES-I with the Regional Team, two days of documentation of The Japan Strategy and The Tokyo Training Center, a three-day National Task Force Meeting, interviews with Buddhist priests, and reports from Don on the IERD Bombay meeting and the Sri Lanka circuit.

Internal: As cherry trees bloom, Suemi Tanaka is sent to the Global Academy and Yasuko Sato is welcomed as staff for two months. House becomes a busy center as staff from all the houses visit for meetings and training; and Jim Bell brings spirit depth to House through singing, harmonica playing and Indian dancing.

The Philippines trip is documented and a file is completed with comments, budgets and recommendations for next year. Initial LENS recruitment results in three organizations showing intense interest in sending participants to the May LENS Symposium.

Internal: New collegium rationale is in a spirit of freshness using learnings from past quarter's experience — Leadership Development, Let's Speak Japanese, Great Wisdom, Japan Study, World Focus — and assignments are made through July.

Contradiction: Moving through full schedules and many recruitment tasks with dancing feet. (Wk. 1)\*

Contradiction: Building structures that will advise and hold accountability for all local economic ventures. (Wk. 1)

External: Extraordinary Task Forces meet — North American Priors, Majuro, and July '82 Prep. Nexus hosts Evening at the Institute with Chicago Theological Seminary students. The Global Academy expands with Nexus and regional participants for ES-I and RS-I.

Internal: Order training intensifies with Wednesday night RS-I study (background papers) and with a collegium on collegiums. The E.G. Artshow on second floor continues to impact House with its display of work — one from each child, even 9-month-old Nicole Westre.

Contradiction: Standing in "Key West" as the hurricane flag goes up and not knowing the location or the shape of the storm. (Wk. 3)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: 5th City Preschool workday is a great success as 20 parents prepare for next week's inspection. St. Paul Central High School student government class spends weekend in 5th City and, developing their presentation for funding, go to corporations. Thirty people from Chicago Region participate in the Guardians meeting.

Internal: House members take two evenings to take a concentrated look at the present situations of the 5th City Preschool, Training, Inc., and FCBC.

Contradiction: Being required to get a clear picture of next year without having decided what all the puzzle pieces are and never having seen a picture of the finished product. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Thirteen presentations with Methodist Church mission committees show that churches are looking for social engagement. Kansas City Region establishes Fort Dodge stronghold with Team spending one week with Appelgate family. Teams pick up two cheques totaling \$30,263.

Internal: Nobody is at home as teams travel to Fort Dodge, Kansas City, Missouri, and Chicago.

Contradiction: "Striking when the iron is hot." (Wk. 2)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Permeators' job in training at Investors Diversified Services (IDS) has exploded from teaching Supervisors Course to training 25 people in Quality Circles groups, 20 PSUs with IDS Life on moving to new offices and exploration of executive strategic planning seminar. New student council of Central High School, organized by the Student Government Class, holds first meetings with 50 motivated members who make plans for action of each department with assignments. Team completes 10 Operational Planning sessions with Corporate Technological Center at Honeywell, with new procedure breakthroughs for one-day planning.

Internal: Elizabeth Loudermilk's 40th birthday celebration is stunning occasion for everyone to celebrate Phase III.

Contradiction: Responding to more telephone calls and opportunities for program than House has time and staff to deliver. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Team hosts Black Engagement Strategy Team reception on Monday night (March 15) and Luncheon Dialogue on Wednesday (March 17) with new colleagues at both occasions, and Verdell Trice enhances Team's appointments with local business people in North St. Louis. Elder Power (in Springfield, S.L.) has key victory with training model for volunteers. *The World Challenge* study led by Fr. Kwasi Thornell, an Episcopal priest, presses group to begin taking seriously the crisis in education and think about some bold and innovative action.

Internal: House experiences globality with the presence of colleagues including Black Engagement Strategy Team — Sharon Turner and Vincent Scott; Verdell Trice from 5th City; Burt and Betty Dyson, who teach in Individual and Family course and celebrate their birthdays at House Church.

Contradiction: Maintaining the global context (with the Panchayat visit coming up) while totally engulfed in the local swirl of implementation and action. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Community Resource Commission and city officials in Madison Heights give nod for fall LENS and launch Quarter IV's Detroit metroplex program push.

Internal: Twenty colleagues with a 16-ft. truck, two pickups, one van and five cars move House into 22-room training center during rain storm with gusts of wind of 65 m.p.h. — spirits remain high as all breeze through day with complimentary lunches from McDonald's and celebrative pizza dinner feast from Little Caesar's Pizza Palace.

Contradiction: Getting "laundry list" into a tactical system that will allow House to do it all. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Second accredited Community Leadership Formation course jointly developed by Cuyahoga Community College and ICA concludes and discussions begin on replicating it for other neighborhoods.

Internal: Panchayat visits metro, with 15 at dinner Friday to hear about IERD and July '82 and metro core at Saturday breakfast for reflection and projection of R.E.P.

Contradiction: Retooling formats for Quarter IV to capitalize on new contacts. (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Urban Churches in Local Mission proposal clears two of three hurdles as local clergy support for Four-Sector Symposium grows daily. New faces appear around the table at fourth Black Engagement luncheon.

Internal: Future Family Forum probes learnings from corporate life style of Flynn Christian Fellowship Houses, Mennonite Service Unit, The Order: Ecumenical, and a cooperative family venture.

Contradiction: Assessing realistically the troops available for today's tactics while ceaselessly raising up new troops for tomorrow. (Wk. 1)

External: Building permit for 4th Street Regional Training Center is secured and celebrated at last! Tim Lush is sent out to Guardians's Meeting in Chicago where seven regional colleagues also participate. George Ensinger attends Basement Alliance meeting to report on the ICA's work and opens communication with other community development organizations.

Internal: House celebrates landmarks in university students' journeys as Tom Price turns in a huge portfolio for credit on his work with the ICA, Peter Clements' design for a sweat-equity rehabilitation project in Brooklyn is chosen to be funded by the city, and Kathryn Geurts is accepted to Sarah Lawrence College.

Contradiction: Getting heating and electrical designs completed and turned in to Archdiocese so that lease for 4th Street facility can be approved. (Wk. 2)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Ellen Howie returns from Charleston, West Virginia, with exciting report on Community LENS in housing projects. Visit with Institute on Man and Science for serious conversation on Project Documentation. Team distributes 500 brochures for Imaginal Methods workshops — six paid registrations are received.

Internal: Panchayat visit is occasion for colleague gathering, including a Troy physician, George Saxton, who once considered volunteering for 5th City Health Outpost when he taught in Chicago.

Contradiction: Tracking people as well as programs. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Margueritte Nock CS-III-A graduate and Black Engagement Strategy follow-up participant visits House to discuss possibility of attending HD-I course. In-depth conversation with Allen Poole, Director of City Ventures, reveals comprehensive plans for Industrial Park and extensive revitalization for Parkside area of west Philadelphia. Prior attends Coordinating Council for Human Services that serves eastern section of North Philadelphia where colleague Shirley Smith gives pitch for HD-I.

Internal: House welcomes Ermetra Black upon her return to sojourn after attending Quarter II Global Academy and spending time in Chicago with her family.

Contradiction: Creating for the Regional Team an image that recruiting HD-I is doing formation. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.**

External: Petersburg, Virginia core meets with leaders of two opposing groups and acts out role of trans-establishment reconciliation as Petersburg Consult is scheduled to occur April 30-May 5. Team dramatizes decision to take responsibility for Computer Paradigm by signing pre-incorporation document. Two team members attend North American Guardians' Meeting in Chicago.

Internal: Team celebrates 50th birthday of Jim Fenton and return of Codie Smith to the House after a bad fall which broke her arm. Larry Ward is sent out to participate in July Council preparation.

Contradiction: Enabling all to see that flying five kites with two strings in a windstorm is possible and fun! (Wk. 2)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Week of development makes numerous contacts with religious orders opening new channels for support for global program and Starks Enterprise Corporation. Kelly Michael decides to attend the Global Academy in April-May. David Morton and Wendy Rose head for West Virginia for ten days of Community LENS programs.

Internal: House sends representative to Area workday on New York facility, hosts Development team and visitors.

Contradiction: Facing squarely operational limits (i.e. one Day One troop) in order to uncover healthier modes of planning and action for the future. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS**

External: Starks House and community welcome 17-person Methodist Youth Group from Ithica New York for three and a half days of painting, tarpapering, wood sawing and splitting, roof repairing, garage cleaning, library moving, Chintz Cottage trimming and cleaning, and "earth closet" building. Over 20 from the Department of Environmental Protection's Bureau of Permits participate in "Creating the New Bureau" consultation, led by Jim and Wendy. Tim aids final preparation for Indian law conference to be held at Harvard and completion of Mic Mac recognition source document.

Internal: Quarter IV House planning reveals Starks downbeat. Series of evening celebrations with Ithica Youth Group include progressive dinner and two-game night.

Contradiction: Enabling critical P.S.U.s to get off the ground with appropriate participation. (Wk. 2)\*

**MONTREAL****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: India Canada event unveils core strength on in-depth care and reflection. Public zoning meeting with residents and business people of Rivierie des Prairies opens doors to dialogue with city structures.

Internal: Ottawa-Montreal shuttle is re-activated with exchange visits as two from Montreal Area attend Sir James Lindsay event and all of Ottawa House spend Saturday here in pre-Area Council visioning session.

Contradiction: Allowing futuristic thinking while present self-support situation seems to take first priority. (Wk. 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Colleague and executive of fibreglass company arranges Lion Club presentation of LENS methods which enlivens community leadership in Erin and sets stage for cross-sector programme. Mississauga youth attend Saturday pedagogy at House in preparation for two high school events, a Student Planning Council and a Global Issues Symposium. Leadership roles will be filled by students of St. Martin's High School, who were part of the Regional Consult and led their own Youth Forum in November, 1981.

Internal: A week of celebration — champagne breakfast over Bill Edwards' recent work permit, Irish coffee for Bernard's birthday and strawberry chocolate cake for Diane's 16th birthday.

Contradiction: Developing effective implementation and reporting mechanisms that empower the corporate thrust and team participation. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Pembroke core reviews Algonquin College class and describes power to change lives through consensus methods in the classroom. Beachburg documentation begins with list of accomplishments since Symposium and Colloquy. Two receptions for Sir James Lindsay plant image of ICA as agent of international development. Senator Florence Bird, Professor Norma Walmsby and Douglas Roche, M. P. from Edmonton agree to be on Board.

Internal: Quarter celebration cabaret and midnight dessert culminate the quarter.

Contradiction: Experiencing being a wallflower who is asked by five princes to dance. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX**

External: North Shore Marketing Centre is launched for Atlantic Potential Academy. Mayor Cochrane of Moncton agrees to invite eleven Maritime cities to the Academy and the Northumberland Cooperative sends out invitation to 100 regional colleagues. External: The first Mexico City CYF is held with 150 youth representing four different parishes. In preparing for the event 17 people representing seven parishes are trained as CYF orchestrators and the CYF orchestrators manual is translated. The Forum is a tremendous event and opens up three possibilities for other CYF's.

Internal: Melisa Lyn Mathews is baptized by Father Rafael Davila in the parish of San Camilo de Lelis where the ICA is working programmatically with the community. The House also welcomes the Wests, who are in Mexico City to help promote LENS.

Contradiction: Ensuring program continuity on the eve of the departure of four people who must leave the country to renew their visas. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Seven village leaders (two women, five men, ages from 43 to 17) become ICA staff in experimental training-sojourn programme. Meeting is held with the Chairman of the Jamaica Council of Churches with favourable response to co-sponsorship of *JAMAICAN POTENTIAL II* in June.

Internal: House swells with seven new members moving in for two-month sojourn in preparation for internship. House spends Holy Week in evaluation, rehearsing screens, manoeuvre building and House life formulation and then celebrates Easter and four birthdays, including Alice Wright's, with a House party.

Contradiction: Implementing Cluster plans, covering geography deepening frame and preparing for major shift to training, while training the catalytic core itself. (Wk. 1)\*

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Two solid Community Forums in the valley signal receptivity and potential for further programming. Donation of typewriters creates possibility of Training Center typing class. Completion of government financial accountability signifies viability of local management systems.

Internal: House and community receive Jose and Zenaida Armas and family and send Jim Newkirk to cluster consult in Barlovento.

Contradiction: Confirming registrations and financial undergirding for HDTs. (Wk. 1)\*

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: The first *nucleo* Cluster Consult of the Spanish-speaking world is held Week 13, Quarter III in Cano Negro, consisting of 100 men and women from 13 villages in Barlovento. Led by 30 students of the last Human development Laboratory, who work from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. for six days and understand themselves to be the Barlovento cadre, this Cluster Consult puts movement in new orbit in the Area.

Internal: Caracas House sees the shape of the new order of Those Who Care with Jon Jenkins, Chicago, Jim Newkirk, Chile, Norris Ladely, Jamaica, and nine Caracas colleagues and 30 Barloventanians filling the patio every night during the Consult with singing and stories.

Contradiction: Building the forms of glue that support the gathered and scattered dynamics of the new Venezuelan Movement in a time of intensive actuation. (Wk. 1)

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Development visit with multi-national company, harvests a new monthly donor from an individual in the company and a request for LENS as soon as possible. Sol de Septiembre's newly legalized and elected *Directiva* (Secretariat) jumps into the task with spirit of concern and cooperation and with great enthusiasm.

Internal: Area trek team returns from 3,200 mile loop through Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay with wild stories, great list of new contacts, and huge appetites after miscalculating the cost of return bus tickets.

Contradiction: Finding a means to limit expanding universe of possibilities without screening out the necessary deed. (Wk. 13)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Two-day Human Development course held at House confirms course as solid tool for colleague development. Faculty strengthened as two Brasilians help teach course. Sale of Brasilis (car) reaps unexpected immediate money.

Internal: House enjoys collegiality of course participants and "training center" concept gets tested.

Contradiction: Ensuring that the municipal teams' "Yes, I can be there" of four weeks ago is a commitment to be there as Community Planning Series enters countdown. (Wk. 13)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the Ford Foundation announces award of US\$24,500 for Brazil, Sydney ESSO sends \$3400, City Corporation sends \$1000, and \$1400 is received from the Government of North Sumatra. Malaysia Airlines agrees to 50% reduction in tickets for Malaysians attending Korean training events. Chicago moves on information interchange with push on files and computer training. The key contradiction lies in the arena of designing training constructs which are practical for a diversity of skills and amount of time available.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Bombay has completed eight priorship collegiums, and treks are sent to Sevagram, Chikhale and Hyderabad for documentation and brief writing. Kuala Lumpur holds workshop on "The World and Movement." Chicago participates in continental and global programmes. The breakthrough involves Band interchange of Talking Papers, regional documentation models, and pulling together Research trek data. The key contradiction lies in the arena of completing the necessary models for regional input and interchange for Research edge for July '82.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the Sub-Continent E.G. summer resources are located in Bombay. Follow-up letters and materials are mailed to contacts made in Bangkok. Program packets for companies are designed and produced in Hong Kong. Updated and polished LENS Facilitator's manual goes to printers in Chicago. North American Area Priors are "in" for meeting, and assignments are sent "out" for a variety of major programmatic efforts. New possibilities break open for human development and training in Thailand and for work with children in urban India. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unbuilt models to ensure that the private sector contacts are used as the key to break open the four-sector coalition.

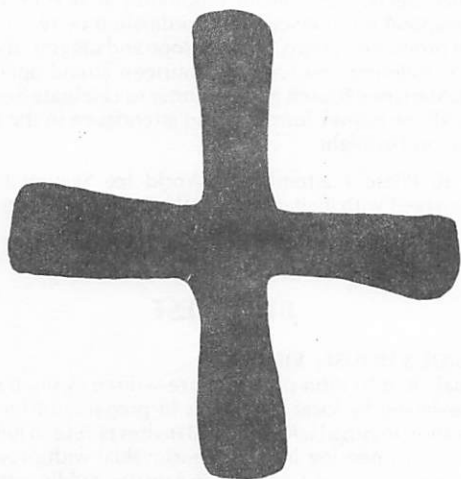
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Implementing all systems for April-May LENS blitz in midst of finalizing positive decisions from "fence-sitters". (Wk. 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Signs now visible in Nacomba after school activities, Ferreiros Health Center, Cambres Adult Education classes, Varzea Social Center, Penude new road, Monteiras Health Fair with 200 people and Granjo Do Te Do fruit-processing industry. Development trek to Porto nets 6 yeses from wine companies. President of Lamego Camara visits first of five villages in Lamego *Concelho*. Consult brochure for May 1-9 is at printers.

Internal: House welcomes Paul and Helen from Brussels Development and Frank Soderlind from Madrid who works on books and gives fine health fair context.

Contradiction: Getting the Consult systems swirling. (Wk. 13)\*

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Fortnight recruitment is concluded with a session planning next year's recruitment strategy and building a prospects list for 1983. Manoeuvres relative to facility search reveal an anticipated depth of support from Church network.

Internal: School holiday creates opportunity for all E.G. to visit elsewhere, enabling adults to focus on task of packing up for a move to the still-not-identified new location.

Internal: House is sent out for two weeks with celebrative feast around Meditation exercises, the film *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and then a symbolic Maundy Thursday breakfast as individuals go to Cardiff, Brussels and Newcastle for discontinuity and the Formation Fortnight.

Contradiction: Firming up position for next year without losing hold of priorities or making ungrounded promises. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Area London E.G. and youth gather for Easter Week Phase I programme. Highlights include trip to Barry Islands and first barbeque of spring. Week closes with inkind ice cream feast and disco.

Internal: Sunday afternoon family time, House sends Murphys to Glasgow and London and Nortons to Ross-on-Wye.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary day-by-day until the kairotic moment comes to build the next long-range plan. (Wk. 2)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Four from House and three others from France take part in Formation Fortnight. Ethical Response course is reported to have "good spirit for our time". Two from Regional Team write the newsletter.

Internal: Arrival of Margaret Braun from Toronto and Cathy Bishop from Sydney, and hearing a report from Yugoslavian youth movement and a lecture on Teilhard de Chardin all enrich House.

Contradiction: Working out of a long vision when springtime tempts fragmented exploration. (Wk. 2)\*

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

##### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Continental Women's Course is launched with 25 present from Glasgow, London, Bristol/Cardiff, Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, and Frankfurt with Brussels women's study group and House as faculty, resulting in the demonstration of new methods of researching the Revolutions and the emergence of a self-conscious network of care. Whole House participates in four-day BF 60,000 consultation in Brugge to train Indonesian Government Officials in methods of regional catalysis. *The Third Wave* study completes sixth session with all day forum and celebration.

Internal: House concentrates on recovery of humanness as a team with weekly "going sane" evening studying Dr. Jean Baker Miller's book, *Toward A New Psychology of Women*, and celebrates Rose Casswell's 28th birthday (cinema and restaurant) as foursome—first time House goes out together.

Contradiction: Discovering that, with an absolute explosion of mission and implosion of spirit, indices of sociological accountability for mission have disappeared and now need to be discovered for Quarter IV planning. (Wk. 12)

Internal: House spends three days doing Quarter IV planning and equips the training centre with newly purchased crockery and tables built by House.

Contradiction: Getting task done in half the time before Easter holidays begin. (Wk. 13)

##### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Section for Health Promotion at W.H.O. requests ICA proposal for intersectoral coordination be re-written for health promotion across urban Europe and suggests they assist with recruitment and funding. Internal: Phase I attends the World Ice Skating Finals in Copenhagen with invitation from the Danish host committee.

Contradiction: Uncovering funding possibilities to launch urban seminar. (Wk. 13)

#### BUDAPEST

##### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: Registration papers are re-written again, translated and reviewed by local colleagues in preparation for official registration in Austria. Key referral invites House to lunch (in a border town peering into Czechoslovakia) with promises to open up more doors for House in Austrian public sector. Half of House departs for Brussels and Formation Fortnight event.

Internal: Self-support is given boost with "Let George Do It" Handyman Service initiated in house of newly appointed American Ambassador (one of three ambassadors in Vienna with portfolio of negotiations for troop reduction) netting \$110.00 for one-and-a-half day's work.

Contradiction: Keeping local regional momentum going when half of House keeps disappearing over horizon. (Wk. 1)

##### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

#### ABIDJAN

##### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Training program continues as Regional Team moves to cluster site for expanded training in village meeting methods in preparation for launching new clusters. Nelson goes to Ghana to do series of village meetings.

Internal: Jean-Claude Kouadio is received as an intern — the first Ivorian intern.

Contradiction: Training new people fast enough to keep up with missional thrust. (Wk. 12)

External: Ijeda Management Committee resolves its own cash flow crisis. Appointment with Federal Agriculture and Co-operative Directors shows support for cooperative training programme. Community Health Forum has 57 participants from Araromi village in Badagry L.G.A.

Internal: Quarter IV planning is celebrated with Easter House Church and day at Badagry Beach. Elina Olatunji receives Nigerian resident visa.

Contradiction: Organizing selves missionally for new quarter. (Wk. 1)\*

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: On multiple site visit at the same time, Zambia Airways, U.S. Embassy and *National Mirror* newspaper are impacted by preschool programme in Diamond of Zambia and high visibility of Kapini. Air India completes Regional Training Centre symbols on the walls. Lions Club visits Kapini to announce 1000-patient health camp for D.O.Z.; and District Headquarters extends mobile health facility. Lyn Mathews, Marian Bassham and the Parekhs symbolically touch soil of Zimbabwe in Area Johannesburg. Board holds their monthly meeting at the House; and Bleadon-Castro team is sent out after six-month sojourn.

Internal: House studies Sphere South and comes up with symbol for Area Kinshasa during Roundtable. House hosts Mavis L. Muyunda, M.P. and U.S. Embassy representatives at a dinner in Kapini HDP.

Contradiction: Building a practical plan that includes new troop configuration to ensure immediate funding, preschool initiation, village industries, and long-range programme support. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Ford Foundation gives approval for second grant submission following positive evaluation of House work. Section House meeting coordinates Quarter IV scheduling, staff and thrust.

Internal: Week II Section House meeting feasts entirely on inkind food; Bob White celebrates his 39th birthday, and movie conversation on *Taps* addresses all with how to articulate victory.

Contradiction: Finding ways of releasing all to insure Quarter IV victories. (Wk. 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Consults for the last two sub-locations in Muthihi Location are completed with great success. The District officer and Location Chief both address crowds of over 250 villagers. Villagers of Gikarandu Sub-Location donate a 90-kilogram bag of maize and beans to feed House until food money arrives.

External: Ten circuits visit all Mitabomi villages (47) for DOOP meetings and Village Leadership Institute recruitment. Muputi Sub-Location meetings are postponed by District Commissioner for workday to plant 6000 trees at the same place. President Moi did a soil conservation workday two weeks ago. First Muputi-Iveti locations leaders meeting is held in Machakos with 116 attending. They decide to commit themselves to do consults (27 people), circuits (46), Village Leadership Institute teaching (55), Impact (36) and Health circuits (53).

Internal: House hosts Ikuyumi HDP staff as they go to set up consult. All circuit teams return for celebration Saturday, and House sends three to Section House meeting in Nairobi.

Contradiction: Dealing with complexity of all the yeses, knowing there is a no somewhere. (Wk. 1)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Mr. Trivedi of ANARDE visits. Continental check-signals meeting sparks the commencement of the quarter.

Internal: House sends out Paula Philbrook to Chicago with guests at Roundtable. House celebrates death anniversary of Vitthu Meshram.

Contradiction: Leaving room to manoeuvre and handle shifts within model that covers exciting demands. (Wk. 2)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Maliwada Cluster document and chart are finally printed. The Programme Chart mural is now in seven of the eight cluster villages. Third village forestry meeting is set up to implement programme.

Internal: Great Hindu New Year celebration is marked with Roundtable. House has deep struggle over 20% medical deduction from stipend.

Contradiction: Finding the context to break through memories of daily society failure. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Quarter IV is launched with last legal hurdle on Training Centre overcome when the Town Planner visits site and gives the OK. Three more site visits in the week keep Team on its toes with visibility and cluster programmes. Block *Gram Sabha* (Community Forum) swings along in high gear with nine more completed. Ambar Charkha Industry receives big boost with order for 300 Kg. per month from Gujarat buyer.

Internal: House feels cooler under the collar as two inkind fans are installed. Hanuman's birthday is celebrated and four people from the House participate in Area Council in Jawale.

Contradiction: Sustaining the posture of finesse and care, in both internal structures and external tasks, when universe shifts every minute. (Wk. 1)\*

Internal: Team gets loan from Canara Bank for 20 sheep for Khambala.

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MALE**

External: Registration numbers are obtained for two villages. Good women's meetings in two villages, sewing survey and locating a manager for the paper-bag industry continue push on women's development. Ten bags of cement are given for the training centre to the CDA by Panchayat Samite, and a new bore well is drilled in Maliwada. Paper is inkinded to start the paper-bag industry. Newsletter is sent to 200 colleagues in four sectors.

Internal: Whole House participates in presentation pedagogy session bringing a consciousness of style. P. Kamble celebrates birthday, and House has celebration for the end of the "Social Actuation" Quarter.

Contradiction: Building new images of economic actuation without losing social momentum. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA**

External: Youth *mandal* (group) collects Rs. 2,000 and buys a Sivaji statue. House visits the BDO (district Officer) for an authorization letter and details for purchase of toilet materials.

Internal: Suresh Patil spends two weeks in Maale on an interchange visit.

Contradiction: Two families have recently left *Nava Gram Prayas*, making placement of troops very difficult. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM**

External: The bakery reopens with a larger market and new management. The team opens a shop near Gandhi Hospital for selling the bread. Sevagram initiates Maharashtra cluster survey with whole House participating in Nandora survey.

Internal: House celebrates completion of a week of priorship training with the birth of the Borker family baby girl.

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI**

External: Sewing classes start in new Tembhurwahi Women's Centre with ten women using inkind machines from the village; Cluster village Bhedoda has women's meeting which decides to start sewing classes and selects women's centre site; and women's meeting in Tembhurwahi sees 60 women decide to hold womens' centre opening and GWF on April 16th and enroll in sewing classes. Two new bullocks arrive in Tembhurwahi on 50% subsidy from Integrated Tribal Development Project (ITDP) and deposits and proposals for four new cows are submitted. Contradiction: Catalysing the cluster's independence from ICA presence. (Wk. 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHABAD**

External: Villagers accompany ICA staff to see silk-worm farm in operation. Two villagers submit applications for silk-worm farm training to District Industry Commission.

Internal: Dabhad *Ashram* becomes battleground for children from village and ICA staff while celebrating *Holi* festival with coloured water.

Contradiction: Missing the week's depth planning brings few victories. (Wk. 11)\*

### **DELHI**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Area circuits begin after three years with trips to Agra and Chandigarh Regions; highlights include meeting with long-time colleagues ready to engage in the mission and meeting Harayana State Government representatives. Panchayat Director promises authorization letter for cluster work. Cluster team returns to *Ashram* after ten days of intensive engagement with two site visits, inkind from Bata Shoes, a blackboard and six *charpoys* as their victories.

Internal: Mr. Dethe arrives with plan from Chandigarh to assist with cluster launch. Allan is sent out to Continental Signals Check, and Abomi goes to Calcutta to choose a bride.

Contradiction: Standing before Team's total bottom line and choosing that part of Area strategy which requires the Team's focus now. (Wk. 1)\*

### **MADRAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Human Development Course in Anantapur Metro with 34 social workers is a stunning success, with three HDTI participants, requests for future programme, and written statements of support for the HDC programme from 20 social workers. Circuit to Vijaywada Region results in two days of escorted trips to futuristic village development schemes, for possible inclusion in IERD Practicum. Letter from Kerala Educational Research Centre for August Imaginal Education Course represents first programme request from Trivandrum (Cochin) Metro in eight years.

Internal: House again discovers that weakness is strength as three teach and bring off a great HDC — one had never taught the course before, one had never been to the course before, and one had never had any ICA course before.

Contradiction: Allowing dialogue between four-year strategy and the openness in every region to reveal the sociological form and new troops of the emerging movement. (Wk. 13)

### **CALCUTTA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: First LENS of quarter with Tata Iron Steel Division is great success, evidenced by participant request for follow-up at close of seminar and requests by Tata management for future training. Contradiction: Maintaining the perspective of strategy in the midst of programme momentum. (Wk. 1)

### **SINGAPORE**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS**

External: Nexus is on location in Sydney, Melbourne, Jakarta and Medan this week, while those in Kuala Lumpur work through Quarter IV maneuver arenas.

Internal: Week of colds and flu accompanies the monsoon, but does not prevent doing the task.

Contradiction: Imminent elections in Indonesia and Malaysia slow down momentum with public sector, LENS and frame. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: Election count-down rivets attention of the nation on campaign, while the House hosts Research and Management Treks. Development maneuvers continue to be a major focus — M \$2,000 is received from QBE this week.

Internal: Traditional Easter is celebrated with a fine breakfast feast at Kuala Lumpur Nexus. First Malaysian sojourner of the year comes for a four-day "look-see".

Contradiction: Establishing firm dates for Quarter IV programmes quickly so that key events do not slide into Quarter I or II. (Wk. 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: House has week of program marketing blitz and being blitzed as 23 calls are made resulting in leadership training modules working, inkind victories and plantation companies visiting House for program information. Sub-District Tanjung Pura Preschool Fair momentum builds with visit to Education Director, TV and with joint sponsorship letter. First Roundtable in series on *The Third Wave* and *The World Challenge* has three regional colleagues present.

Internal: House welcomes Ann Epps for regional development and marketing trek which has whole House building proposals and budgets.

Contradiction: Making sure transportation does not block 653 preschoolers from being the stars of the "Preschool Symphony Fair". (Wk. 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: Indonesia Chamber of Commerce Secretary General proposes LENS as part of Chamber training program with Dutch businessmen grant. Team met with Mrs. Abidin, Treasurer ICA: Indonesia and her consultant to set up ICAI financial systems.

Internal: House celebrates Easter with first House Church in three years and Easter egg hunt for the emerging generation and sends out Doug Rettig to the Global Academy with gifts from the East. Quarter IV planning places emphasis on HDZ program webbing along with ICAI systems, long-range permeation, Regional Team action and cash in the bag.

Contradiction: Building necessary revolutionary systems that will enable global and national ICA operations. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: A revised plan of operations for ICA Ujung Pandang for 1982-83 is written in one day, complete with revised budget. Bappeda LENS follow-up visit begins plan for agency LENS presentation.

Internal: Terry McCabe is sent to Jakarta for three weeks of framing. Ping-pong fever hits children, youth and staff in Bontoa.

Contradiction: Clarifying the quarter's thrust to use time effectively. (Wk. 2)\*

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Management sends David Elliott to Area Tokyo, and news from Seoul Development circuit reports US\$14,000 from Honam Oil. Site visit to Zamboanaga in Manila Region requests proposal for Australian Development assistance Bureau funds and participation in Mactan training program.

Internal: Internal life is restructured after discontinuity wind-down and year-end self-support victory announced. Roundtable study of Americas Challenge marketing package elicits hour-long conversation.

Contradiction: Interpreting ambiguity as a block rather than the gift of creativity. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: Two teams are sent to Taipei for LENS marketing, Chinese company development, and recruitment for second HDTI in Taiwan.

Internal: House has planning session for next four month's programs and attends one Chinese colleague's wedding.

Contradiction: Having only two Chinese staff to handle all programs and activities. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Trek to Kaohsiung procures US \$2,500 in developed funds and a LENS follow-up consultation with an ICI subsidiary. Initial probe for an HDTI facility turns up 10 leads.

In Manila, the Philippine Health Minister is full of affirmation and new avenues to explore. Two 20-container rock orders are received. Union Oil President of the P.G.I. hosts Team for lunch and his man from L.A. presents Team with cheque for Putsan, Tiwi Project. Australian Government flies Team to Zambounga to their largest Aid Project in the world to see if ICA can help them. AID evaluation is underway with British consultant and Cebu guardian. Three companies request script and photos for international magazines. Health Minister from India visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Area Priors' trip is highlighted by reports from Hong Kong, Taiwan, India, England and North America. Hosting has its advantages as House takes Japanese guests to a disco.

Contradiction: Coordinating calender to include new programmes while 30 ongoing HDPs intensify. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Two workdays are set both in San Mriguel and Sudtonggan by the group in Japan. Team is assigned in social and economic programs in the whole MI-24. Twenty-three Purok leaders are trained for future village work.

Internal: House welcomes group from Osaka, Japan, while sending Steve and Fred to Tiwi to meet the Governor and Mayor of Legaspi City. Week is highlighted by Philippine and Japanese cultural event.

Contradiction: Facing many tasks and figuring how to move quickly while training is going on. (Wk. 10)

External: First harvest of Magtuod Preschool Garden has good peachay squash and cucumber. Dr. Javier visits Langub for skin disease check-up and distributes medicine. Sewing Industry receives Gaisano order for 200 electric fan covers, and 18 sewing workers put up capital of 100 each to buy more materials. Mountain Cluster Preschool teachers participate in 45th anniversary of Davao. Langub Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting with 42 pesos store gain.

Internal: House has workdays and applies Bagrass fertilizer.

Contradiction: Securing more vegetable seedlings and fruit trees in Bureau of Forest Industry for Demonstration Farm. (Wk. 10)

### **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The Japan Urban Planning Council commits three LENS for City Planners — the first one is for June. Toppan Printing Company (the world's second largest) donates design work and 3000 new Town Meeting workbooks roll off the presses.

Internal: Management Centrum arrives to discuss ICA legal and financial plans with House and advisors. Elliott gives a stunning collegium on computers and the future. The first public Tokyo House Training Center brochure is finished and ready for distribution.

Contradiction: Structuring The Order: Ecumenical life to be attractive to a few of the many disillusioned salaried men of Japan. (Wk. 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Yeosu project initiation gets a big push with the start of three-week circuit by David Hutcheons, Min Sung and Kim Sung Hee, and with \$15,000 grant from Honam (Union) Oil.

Internal: David Elliott arrives on first Management Centrum visit in over a year.

Contradiction: Putting form on the many new possibilities knocking on the door. (Wk. 2)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON**

External: House visits stakes of the cluster to prepare for great planning and training event with five university agriculture professors; however, at the scheduled time they call to postpone because of rain. With room full of villagers, Miss Han steps in to lead training session on treasury operations and a discussion of cluster issues. Mr. and Mrs. Min circuit in Yeo Cheon County and make set-up calls for next three months of new cluster launch.

Internal: House and village host Seoul Regional Council which creates six-month calendar and celebrate with one-day holiday trip to Sok Ri Mountain, site of world's tallest standing Buddha, and a national park.

Contradiction: Learning style of catalytic doing which releases staff from doing to being the presence. (Wk. 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: First session of Imaginal Education has impact on resident volunteers and advisors in spring training series which includes Imaginal Education and CS-I. Okinawa circuit is off to a slow start as Bob Hanson and David Reese take a 27-hour boat trip to Naha to begin 10 days of LENS recruitment and Town Meeting set-up and facilitation. Rob Duffy joins them, and Mr. Tsukamoto arranges business trip to coincide with village Town Meeting. Housing for the Team is provided by the Roman Catholic and Anglican Bishops.

Internal: House sends out Mr. A. Watanabe, long-time colleague and advisor, to become part of the Regional Team in Hiroshima.

Contradiction: Creating and sticking to a new recruitment strategy for the many scheduled events. (Wk. 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: LENS team experiences initiation by fire during two-day seminar with a Roman Catholic order and establishes a continuing relationship. The Philippines trip is documented and a file is completed with comments, budgets and recommendations for next year. Initial LENS recruitment results in three organizations showing intense interest in sending participants to the May LENS Symposium.

Internal: New collegium rationale is in a spirit of freshness using learnings from past quarter's experience — Leadership Development, Let's Speak Japanese, Great Wisdom, Japan Study, World Focus — and assignments are made through July.

Contradiction: Moving through full schedules and many recruitment tasks with dancing feet. (Wk. 1)

External: Week of LENS blitz yields two "yes" responses, New Castle citizen's group and Table Talk Chickens. \$3,000 is received from ESSO. Easter mailing and regional newsletters are sent out, and article on LENS is written for *Rydge's In Marketing* magazine (circulation 10,000) at the invitation of the Australian Marketing Institute. Paperwork for overseas tax exemption is completed and ready for submission to Canberra, already approved by Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Contradiction: Keeping up momentum while ensuring the community picks up new management and leadership responsibility. (Wk. 2)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: CYF is held with 33 student council representatives from six schools; staff is very excited and wants to do methods with teachers. House continues framing push with educators via attendance at Women in Education Conference. WAJT (Western Australian Institute of Technology) U.N. club visits to hear presentation on Aboriginal Development in Australia and the ICA's role. Mowanjumb and Oombulgurri stories catalyze club to state common depth concerns for cultural gifts of humanity.

Internal: Dene and June Rundle invite House for dinner and surprise us with request to teach their children the art form method.

Contradiction: Finding ways to be actively patient with no holistic view of our future strategies as an Order. (Wk. 2)\*

Contradiction: Building structures that will advise and hold accountability for all local economic ventures. (Wk. 1)

External: Community Planning Consult appointments continue in Valley and San Francisco with good responses. Vocational Journey Lab and Formation Colloquy PSU constructs are worked on as well as Sanger documentation. Berkeley speaking engagement and Sanger HD-I recruitment fill a busy week.

Internal: New arrival of Chevy Chevette car (gift from Wesley Lachman's mother) caps celebrative week of Melanie Harris' birthday and Joel going to Guardians.

Contradiction: Sharpening Day II designs and maneuvers with only permeation troops present. (Wk. 2)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

Contradiction: Expanding capacity of Regional Team engagement to tackle multi-faceted tasks at the same time as corporate focus is required. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Fourth session of P.M.A. (Participative Management Approach) for McDonald's store managers signals midpoint in the course. Accountability letters sent to owner-operators, Oak Brook, GRC and Area Prior, announce preparation for second series.

Internal: Quarterly planning produces maneuvers for "Developing the Colleague Movement" and is celebrated with first cook-out of the year and home-made strawberry ice cream. Tony Williams receives acceptance for entrance to the University of Georgia for 1982-83 school year.

Contradiction: Tracking people as well as programs. (Wk. 12)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Marguerite Nock CS-III A graduate and Black Engagement Strategy follow-up participant visits House to discuss possibility of attending HD-I course. In-depth conversation with Allen Poole, Director of City Ventures, reveals comprehensive plans for Industrial Park and extensive revitalization for Parkside area of west Philadelphia. Prior attends Coordinating Council for Human Services that serves eastern section of North Philadelphia where colleague Shirley Smith gives pitch for HD-I.

Internal: House welcomes Ermetra Black upon her return to sojourn after attending Quarter II Global Academy and spending time in Chicago with her family.

Contradiction: Creating for the Regional Team an image that recruiting HD-I is doing formation. (Wk. 12)

Internal: House bulges with people and spirit on Easter weekend for Area Council as "Imitations" provides spirit backdrop for Council. House skits and Easter Bunny rock House with side-splitting hilarity.

Contradiction: Moving on the recruitment and development targets that will release paid registrations for the Atlantic Potential Academy. (Wk. 1)\*

### **MEXICO CITY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY**

External: The first Mexico City CYF is held with 150 youth representing four different parishes. In preparing for the event 17 people representing seven parishes are trained as CYF orchestrators and the CYF orchestrators manual is translated. The Forum is a tremendous event and opens up three possibilities for other CYF's.

Internal: Melisa Lyn Mathews is baptized by Father Rafael Davila in the parish of San Camilo de Lelis where the ICA is working programmatically with the community. The House also welcomes the Wests, who are in Mexico City to help promote LENS.

Contradiction: Ensuring program continuity on the eve of the departure of four people who must leave the country to renew their visas. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY**

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)

### **HAVANA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: Seven village leaders (two women, five men, ages from 43 to 17) become ICA staff in experimental training-sojourn programme. Meeting is held with the Chairman of the Jamaica Council of Churches with favourable response to co-sponsorship of *JAMAICAN POTENTIAL II* in June.

Internal: House swells with seven new members moving in for two-month sojourn in preparation for internship. House spends Holy Week in evaluation, rehearsing screens, manoeuvre building and House life formulation and then celebrates Easter and four birthdays, including Alice Wright's, with a House party.

Contradiction: Implementing Cluster plans, covering geography deepening frame and preparing for major shift to training, while training the catalytic core itself. (Wk. 1)

### **LIMA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: Two solid Community Forums in the valley signal receptivity and potential for further programming. Donation of typewriters creates possibility of Training Center typing class. Completion of government financial accountability signifies viability of local management systems.

Internal: House and community receive Jose and Zenaida Armas and family and send Jim Newkirk to cluster consult in Barlovento.

Contradiction: Confirming registrations and financial undergirding for HDTS. (Wk. 1)

### **CARACAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: The first mobilization treks to New Nucleo villages are smashing success. La Boca village has 40 at guild and stake meetings. House plaques start to appear all over villages. INAGRO (Government Agricultural Agency) assigns full-time Agricultural Instructor to the Nucleo.

Internal: Jon Jenkins' enlivening presence merits a "Non Copenragen" send out.

Contradiction: Keeping ahead of selves on manuals, treks and government delivery of basic services. (Wk. 2)\*

### **BUENOS AIRES**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Development visit with multi-national company, harvests a new monthly donor from an individual in the company and a request for LENS as soon as possible. Sol de Septiembre's newly legalized and elected *Directiva* (Secretariat) jumps into the task with spirit of concern and cooperation and with great enthusiasm.

Internal: Area trek team returns from 3,200 mile loop through Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay with wild stories, great list of new contacts, and huge appetites after miscalculating the cost of return bus tickets.

Contradiction: Finding a means to limit expanding universe of possibilities without screening out the necessary deed. (Wk. 13)

### **RIO DE JANEIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Team does initial mapping of Bracana/Tatus area. In spite of rain and mud, Jeep allows fourth weekly meeting to happen in Bracana/Tatus. Visiting in Bracana/Tatus includes speaking to the sewing class and finishes preparation for Community Planning Series.

Internal: Whole House spends Good Friday holiday in Bracana/Tatus.

Contradiction: Ensuring Municipal Team participation in the Community Planning Series. (Wk. 1)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that in North America the majority of the program money has been collected for the West Virginia LENS and the head of agricultural grants for Rockefeller Foundation is interested in further conversation on IERD. Ford Foundation in Kenya requests new submission following positive evaluation. Kaula Lumpur submits \$80,000 proposal to Jakarta pharmaceutical firm. North American teams report meeting many new key people in private and voluntary sectors due to IERD and patron follow-up. Bombay focuses political clout on 35 CCA approval. Hong Kong has major region by region talk-through in relation to the printout. The key contradiction lies in the arena of how to make the broad-stroke six-month maneuvers realistic on a monthly cash basis.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports a multitude of spinning plates — ES-I manual revisions and teaching, *IMAGE* editing, Post-Secondary Education Symposium recruitment, Korean Church strategy and HDZ evaluations — is punctuated by points of dialogue and interchange. The Global Academy hosts the Nexus at their engaging *Cabaret*. The key contradiction lies in the arena of inventing the tools and vehicles that symbolize the manifestations of the new paradigm within ourselves.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Brussels moves into new location which is baptised by 101 people attending the Formation Fortnight. LENS marketing goes well in Kuala Lumpur with five scheduled. The breakthrough is seeing again and again that ICA methods really are preparing people to handle the birth of a new century. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the uncreative response to the interface between actualizing forward moving strategy and building the formation platform which sustains troops.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that inkind paper maneuver continues to be productive with 86 cases of light grey quality paper, valued at \$1,600, delivered one day after yes. The annual report moves into graphic set-up as typesetting is completed. The month of April is being closed on time. Configuration of troops and training continues to develop spirit prowess and functional epitude. The key contradiction lies in the arena of unrealized anticipated income from prioritized program.
