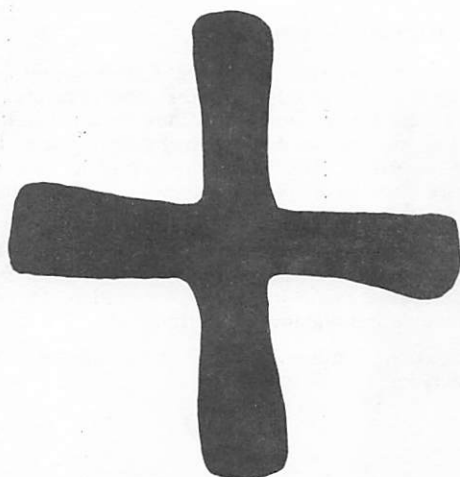

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: All programs jell into one thrust as the *Grito* is published at the University of Vila Real with inkinded printing; the two-day economic module produces a four-sector plan for small village industries, agro-business commercialization and grape upgrading; Kenya night at the Roundtable allows regional colleagues to dialogue with the trek team, and the Braganca team returns after completing 13 TMs. Contradictions collegium results in breaking loose strategy of cashing in our advantages of the rural cluster, agricultural demonstration, and 15% formation. A trip to the Montalegie demonstration goat farm fills all with new images of animal upgrading and adds an invitation to collaborate with the Ministry of Agriculture. The development team returns from Porti bringing an inkinded video cassette machine.

Internal: The house hosts 23 people including the total Madrid House, for an Economic module and HDZ trek. The total group celebrates Thanksgiving with turkey at a Portugese inn. Movies on the video machine, folk dancing with the Penude dancers and inkinded Mateus wine from the Region make the gathering a celebration.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly to co-ordinate one four-sector thrust out of the HDZ trek so as not to lose momentum with Christmas and HDTI coming.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Eight days of G.C.F.s are done in six villages of the Comarca of Ariza in the Province of Zaragoza, ending with a fine assembly of all six villages. Also, full imaginal leadership training sessions were done each day for the local team, all in Spanish. Spain's two Global Advisory Board members were visited and updated. Barbara and Lucy finish up the second set of seven villages (13 in two weeks) with a grand assembly in Branganca, Northeastern Portugal.

Internal: Maria Fry and Bill Alerding return from exciting Ariza (Zaragoza) meetings and begin pulling together an Imaginal Education training document for Spanish translation. They also bring a huge box of almonds as a gift from a local Ariza team. Mary Kaye returns from her 3 week European trek for Ohio's Wittenberg University while Sara Lilja prepares for her trip to the Lamego HDZ empowerment trek.

Contradiction: Focusing on new demands on IERD and the Alcorcon set of meetings in the midst of five other time consuming missional demands.(Week 7)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The Glasgow circuit is completed with visits to old colleagues and new N.S.C. possibilities in addition to calls for W.H.O., LENS, and Volunteer Service Programme. A 15 person Volunteer Orientation Weekend is held with ten who indicate a readiness to continue with the programme as volunteers to the Third World. A budget is submitted to the Laing Construction Co. for the 7,000 already committed for the El Bayad project.

Internal: The House operates with its smallest number since September hosting an equal number of guests on study night, celebrating Thanksgiving American style, and maintaining relationships with inkind vegetable market and bread merchants.

Contradiction: Using the HDZ Event as an occasion for putting a focus on multiplication of options in the external mission.(Week 8)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Team sends out the newsletter with a striking drawing of the photograph of two women (from India brochure) in a gesture of mutual respect, a symbol for the IERD. The House creates broad outlines of a nine month house hunt strategy. A team studies the effects of computers on society.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

Internal: M. K. Soderlind's visit, though short, brings significant sharing on IERD support in Spain and brooding on the life of the Order.

Contradiction: Strategically enlarging the nation's steering committee of the IERD. (Week 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Events keep the Training Centre busy every day: Third Wave Study, Women's Studies, Teachers' Meeting, Social Change Think Tank, HDZ - RSP.

Internal: Lieve, Herman, and Kenneth turn carpenter and build a collegium table for twenty, giving elbow room and space for dinner guests. Bob Gilbert's slides provide a 'laugh-in' evening and myths fill our Going Sane evening.

Contradiction: Getting the wheels (like money) under the missional vehicle now that the engine is racing. (Week 7)

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: This week we heard Pht. Theyshon recommend ICA methods by saying "I use them in everything I do. I can't avoid this. We taught the first German language RS-I ever and found it to be a tool for dialogue in the 80's". English Community Marketing begins with two calls and visits.

Internal: There is non-stop cooking during the RS-I as course food and Turkish "Mom's Home Coking" proceed side by side with fine celebrations and a welcome for two sojourners in the Volunteers Orientation Program.

Contradiction: Turning December into a set up month for Quarter III events planned for January. (Week 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Saturday double feature of Interim Board Meeting and Regional Planning Evening overlap as eight present at the Board Meeting expands to 10 as returned Volunteers Oscar and Hugo close one meeting and open another with a Portugal slide show. December open house will provide opportunity for other returned Volunteers to show their slides.

Internal: The House begins to prepare itself for the IERD luncheon by creating more space in the living room, hanging new curtains, and procuring housing for guests. The National train strike provides opportunity for a colleague to sojourn two nights.

Contradiction: Sustaining the motivation to complete the necessary tactics for a full program year when faced with the promise of unknown variables. (Week 8)\*

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: An HDZ Regional Strategy Practicum was held with six of the Regional Team and Lit. 1.5M(USD 1,000) was received from the Augustinian Fathers.

Internal: Caritas has approved Lit.5M in scholarships for the SEM ensuring self-support. Fasting and Feasting celebrates this self-support victory.

Contradiction: Heating up of the mission has rendered the complexity of practices disabling. (Week 8)\*

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: The working group on urban housing is surprised during a ten day practicum by projections that 30% of the future work force will probably operate from their homes with computer terminals, demanding a new perspective in urban housing. Top level appointments are set up with W.H.O., for a new round of negotiations. The team working on "youth in development" has project brief ready for printing.

Internal: For the first time this year, self support breaks through into the black by Nov.30th, and the House celebrates with a wine and cheese party and movies.

Contradiction: Creating the procedures and gathering information for a final Urban Housing working group to be ready for the documentation of the first of nine sectors of the urban research project. (Week 8)

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: One-day excursion to Area City, Budapest raises the question of how to care for a nation whose structures are not directly accessible. The first Think/Tank on Participatory Polity finds nine gathered in a stimulating event, with a "Yes" to further research. The IERD/Development circuit with assistance from Nexus opens some new possibilities with youth networks, the money and frame.

Internal: The last two rooms fully electrified, gas line connected, bath tub installed and walls replastered signals a new "comfort" phase in House renovation. M. Maguire brings the "other dimension" to House life.

Contradiction: Finding the key to unlock the IERD as a real possibility for Austria. (Week 8)\*

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE GIZA — EL BAYAD**

External: Cluster leader, Sheik Abdel Hamid, assists in securing a letter from the Markaz(District). The People's Council President affirms the ICA's expansion plan, thus releasing USD 20,000 Ford Foundation grant prior to completing the lengthy routine of a new government contract. Development and inkind blitz, using Cairo guardians and Margreet Farid, results in LE 1000 working. Linen and cutlery committed and guardians following up on plumbing and electrical supplies.

Internal: The auxiliary is soaked as Bayad experiences the worst rain and flash flood anyone can ever remember, leaving 20-25 homes seriously damaged, the road washed out in two places, electrical lines and water pipes broken and three good size lakes in the village.

Contradiction: Succeeding on four two-week manoeuvres when we have not broken through to optimum internal organization and troop assignment rationale. (Week 6)

### **ABIDJAN**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Phase I of health surveys, animal disease research and exploration into exporting industry is launched and Phase II of the village re-entry meetings and centre installation is begun. The Director of the National Centre for Economic and Social Research agrees to be on the ICA Board.

Internal: New team member, Marie, an Ivoirian woman who speaks Baoule, gives the team a new facet and added advantage in village health surveys.

Contradiction: Discerning what is necessary in the arena of economic development in order to break open markets while also speeding up the momentum of programmes in progress. (Week 7)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Visits to key guardians strengthen IERD and the second meeting of the IERD National Steering Committee is hosted. Development nets another \$1200 to put on top of last week's largest week of \$5600US. A quick trip to Benin City sets up the follow-up on village cooperatives with the Nigerian Rubber Board.

Internal: House participates in a newsletter mailing blitz as Quarter III vision and planning takes shape. Bells pack for their visa reentry trip to Abidjan and Lee Ferguson wraps up four years of work as he packs for London. Strategy collegiums are capped off with a great 'poverty' muse. The House experiences a great week of collegiums on Research Think Tanks and Order Principles. ICA belongings are moved to new office outpost in Ikoridu in preparation for Lagos House relocation in Orlu in December.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the details of finances, development, communications and IERD so that momentum is maintained on all fronts. (Week 7)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Circuits to the Diamond of Zambia end with three village assemblies. The result is that three pre-school buildings are under various stages of construction. This was a three week maneuver. Villages industry complex generates K631.00 since September 21st and management team begins to create the systems necessary to run the truck, tractor, maize mill and carpenters smoothly. Women's mat industry sells 80 mats to one hardware store after completing an order for 300 mats delivered to another. Site visits include the Danish Volunteer Service, the Swedish School, Roundtables, YWCA, and Lions Club, with the highlight being the Christian Children's Funds who returned the next day with cameras to take pictures of the pre-school and to promise support in March '83 when their Lusaka office opens. Development reports that K4000 is raised from 15 different donors.

Internal: Rev Muloshi reports on his experience at Academy. The House and village Independence Day celebration (October 24th) results in a chicken feast at Mundewanga Zoo, and occasions laughter as well as thoughtful reflection on the coming year. Sending Danaraj to his new assignment grounds the fact that we are a small team.

Contradiction: Knowing that 'small is beautiful', deciding to continue rather than wait for new arrivals. (Week 4)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: First of three Section wide impact programmes involves all Section staff in doing one-day planning sessions with 68 villages. Ford Foundation money arrives (after being lost for two months) bringing Development close to its first million shilling month! The first IERD prospective project site visit is done in midst of graduating 48 students from HJTI No. 11.

Internal: A great week of giving thanks culminates with a delicious chicken feast, the sendout of Charles Lingo and El sha Odari for the IERD circuit to Zimbabwe through Zambia, Dan O'Laughlin's collegium and a conversation on possible ICA work in Mauritius and end-of-term Christmas plays and parties for all House E.G.

Contradiction: Lightly knitting together our planning and coordination at the end of a busy quarter in order to meet the end of the calendar year schedule. (Week 8)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KABIRO

External: The Construction Guild finally has delivered prepaid timbers and completed roof trusses for the first two classrooms and store room for Adult Education in Phase II of the Demonstration Structure Complex. The Wakulima Guild elects James Odera as its new chairman. While struggling with late payment of teacher salaries the School committee finds it necessary to be strong and willing to act responsibly.

Internal: Kabiro Auxiliary reaches full strength with the arrival of Stanley Shivayilu and his wife Neddy, and promptly disperses with three assigned to the Section meeting and one community person recruited for Health Survey Trek of three weeks.

Contradiction: Moving community groups beyond power/prestige tactics toward comprehension of the servant leader role. (Week 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: The Section House sends out a team for two weeks to Samutet to train village health caretakers. Four circuiters are on the road setting up for Kakemega three saturation, Hawenga and Kutuni Sub-locations consults. Evaluation of health and agriculture training of auxiliaries and village volunteers for Ford Foundation Grant continues.

Internal: Kenyatta Day celebrated near the new project site visiting Kapenguira Prison where Kenyatta was detained, the event marking the beginning of the Mau Mau.

Contradiction: Discovering ourselves in the midst of many programs and over extended again. (Week 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-MUGUMOINI

External: New structures and methods address Section B Project Directors and the Muthithi circuiters as preparations are made for the expansion of the Muthithi location toward full Division Cluster Projects. Circuiters take the new two day model for circuiters on the road for the first time. Kaptel Consult is completed with 60 participants throughout the week, almost all of whom are men.

Internal: Three truck loads of timber are inkinded for doors, beds, signboards, chicken house and cupboards and circuit training is held after receiving reports. We receive Dr. Joseph Mbindyo from the Kenyatta University College for the Health Survey Training and then send the interviewers out to three Sub-locations.

Contradiction: Internalizing new methods and new relationships. (Week 4)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA-KAMWELINI

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA

External: A Think Tank on Participatory Polity is held in Aurangabad, with good participation from the Aurangabad and Maliwada Clusters. Received money from Aurangabad Annual Appeal

Internal: Brian Stanfield and Kaye Hayes arrive in Ashram. Two collegiums focus on Training and Think Tanks.

Contradiction: Knowing and getting the time rhythm of Cluster and government people. (Week 8)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—CHIKHALE

External: After many weeks of corporate work with the village and inkind efforts in Bombay. The Sewing Centre with four new machines is opened in Wangni Village in the Cluster. The Women of Wangni host a great event. Representatives from the Block Development Office attend. The integrated Rural Development Programme is held in the Cluster. Government officials and Canara Bank present a new subsidy loan system. Two hundred lower caste people attend the meeting and fill out forms!

Internal: Celebration of the return from a great Diwali discontinuity with a collegium on 15 billion years of cosmos and gridding the block. Air India brings a trunk load of bread. The Mashe's first wedding anniversary and Jeanette Stanfield's 41st birthday are celebrated.

Contradiction: Nurturing already scheduled events so that we deliver the goods in fine style. (Week 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE BOMBAY—VAVIHARSH**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE PUNE—JAWALE**

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (This is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Estsablishing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actuation. (Week 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE PUNE—MAALE**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE PUNE—BUDHODA**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAGPUR—SEVAGRAM**

External: The school district holds a tournament of games in Sevagram and the staff hosts many visitors. Rs3000 is raised for Annual Appeal from Nagpur. Bakery accounts for the last six months are completed.

Internal: The kitchen is spruced up with a fine whitewash job and the office re-organized after HDTS is completed.

Contradiction: Creating necessary practical models to enable quick movement after Diwali. (Week 6)

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAGPUR—TEMBURWAHI**

External: The Bhedoda village comes alive as 24 women plan registration of their Mahila Mandal(group) and village leaders organize shramdan to dig drains and resurface streets. Two Health Camps are organized by Ballapur Rotary Inner Wheel and Rajura Panchayat Samit immunize over 400 children in Bhedodana and Temburwahi. Cultural programs in Sakharwalin and Bhedoda give people a taste of Andrah Pradesh, and Ballapur Youth Alini - Orchestra performs before over 500 Temburwahi people. The Annual Appeal three-day blitz nets RS.750 in-hand and RS.500 working, opens doors to future company funding and changes our "receiver" mindset into "every person a developer." The Cluster newsletter is produced and distributed in record time.

Internal: We host Temburwahi women leaders to Roundtable for the first time, celebrate the full moon with "Kajaggari" and welcome back the HDTI Team from Sevagram. Mukesh Taksande and Hiranman Kakane visit to gun the Annual Appeal and most of the Ashram is sent out to celebrate "Diwali." Those remaining host Ali Shende and his Ballapur Youth musicians.

Contradiction: Manoeuvring to identify clear priorities in Temburwahi, the Cluster and four sector relationships. (Weeks 5,6 & 7)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAGPUR—DABHAD**

##### **DELHI**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Five leading representatives of Canara Bank, Delhi visit Khore E Sarohi to talk with villagers and confirm their resolve to work directly with us on total village development in the cluster. Annual Appeal nets Rs4750 in hand, Rs15000 committed and Rs1200 in-kind. Government of India symbolizes its support of Nava Gram Prayas by giving a 'no objection' letter to the IERD. The national TV crew spends two days in Sikrol filming the village. First village signboard is painted and erected.

Internal: Tribhuwans arrive after continental assignment at HDTI, while Bhojars leave for Diwali discontinuity. The GDC and Panchayat honours the House with their presence. Annual Appeal team enables a fine feast at the Roundtable celebration with chicken and in-kind beer.

Contradiction: Deciding we can build the necessary models to make a demonstration of our Internal Life. (Weeks 5&6)

##### **MADRAS**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Fifty-five attend Gram Sabha at Kothagudem village near Hyderabad. Dr. Vithal Rajan, NSC member (Indian Steering Committee) offers his office, his files, his computer and himself to the IERD work. Visits set up for an IERD/RDS event in Hyderabad uncover a collegial Jesuit who studied in Chicago and was a frequent visitor to ICA Chicago in 1973.

Internal: Arulaswamy's assignment to Maliwada prompts the decision to locate all Area Madras ICA troops in Bangalore by January 1, 1983. Many visitors this week include Canara Bank, Sumitra Paul, Charles Innes, Lionel Paul and Sharma.

Contradiction: Sorting out myriad of details that would have us all in Bangalore as of January 1. (Week 8)\*

##### **CALCUTTA**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: The first HDC of the year is held with 33 bustee workers from nine different communities, out of which come six new guild members. 47 invitation letters are sent to other Regions for participation in the Imaginal Method Academy.

Internal: The House experiences itself as a Global Wayside Inn as nine people drop in for two hours and Japanese colleague Manami arrives and gets oriented to India.

Contradiction: Making week eight death ground. (Week 7)

##### **SINGAPORE**

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: A three-day session is held on Human Development Zone empowerment trek. The ICA staff attend the Bangdes one day consultation in the governor's office for coastal villages in North Sumatra.

Internal: Pat Tuecke and Don Clark conduct the HDZ trek, guardians gathering for informal conversation, and the Roundtable has guests.

Contradiction: Clarifying our residency in relation to empowerment of our Zone strategy and training center. (Week 8)\*

##### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: The House launches a three week marketing and development campaign. A weekend workday on office systems expands the filing space.

Internal: The House celebrates Deepavalli with two days of visiting relatives and of exchanging of Deepavalli sweets with neighbours. The Newkirks and Carling Reusora arrive from Medan, and Kathleen Tonge, an Irish volunteer, spends three days with us on the way to her assignment in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Creating the working decor that holds us before the Quarter and its campaigns in the midst of the overwhelming details of the daily task. (Week 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: The first Think Tank in the Region, 'Women's Development in Indonesia', brings together eleven women who have an interview with the first Woman's Minister, Maria Ulfah, in the revolutionary government of 1945-48. The four week Global Language School ends, the first with a private sector company, with promises of more schools this year. The Board of the Institute of Cultural Affairs: Indonesia approves a budget of \$205,000, confirms finance procedures and takes responsibility for raising \$90,000. First week of a two-week development push creates Rp44,000,000 of working money and Research Assembly brochures are mailed

Internal: Tueckes return from Bontoa where one week's work brings great strides towards a new government agreement with the Province. The House creates a live Meditative Council using the meditation game construct from the Academy Ecclesiola Guide. A Week II workday creates a dramatic transformation of House space with enlarged, more functional kitchen, sparkling new-painted office and lounge and new collegium wall and white board. The House welcomes Elizabeth Caperton and Marsha Stansbury for development, and Don Clark to put a new spark under the GRA preparation.

Contradiction: With no registrations in hand, how to ensure participation in the participative polity GRA in only 2½ weeks. (Weeks 6&7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: The first Think Tank in the Region Ujung Pandang is conducted with 15 participants assigned from Bangdes, Dinas Kesehatan and the ICA. Think Tank is followed by two days of methods training and a village meeting. An invitation is received for more training with Chamber of Commerce and PMP 28 proposal is submitted.

Internal: A major leap in our ability to understand the world occurs as arrangements are made to receive an English newspaper, Nancy Stoval returns after seven weeks of teaching A.L.S.

Contradiction: Building images that build on recent victories. (Week 7)\*

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: First two asked say "Yes" to having an Executives Guild morning breakfast as a LENS follow-up giving courage to schedule the first event. Largest developed amount is deposited in one week thus far this year.

Internal: We enjoy the sweet taste of turkey and collegiality as we join the Nexus for a Great Thanksgiving Feast.

Contradiction: Finding the vehicle for locally-based programs as we expand into urban communities. (Week 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Regional guardian, Bill Wang, joins Gordon and Lucas from the House and Hur Myung Hee from Hong Kong on a one week circuit to Kaohsiung and Hai Ou, visiting ten companies, renewing contacts with colleagues, and participating in the Grand Opening celebration of the new Hai Ou Temple. Two important visits relate to IERD framing. Mr Lin of the Council for Agricultural Planning and Development invites us to take a two to three day tour to visit government sponsored community development projects. Prof. Tseng Hsiao, Chairman of Asia Land Reform and Rural Development Center who, as an expert on the ROC land reform and rural development programs, gives us several references to follow up. Bill Bigelow attends a dinner for Gov. Kit Bond and takes the opportunity to make new development contacts.

Internal: Notification of approval of Joy's L-I visa occasions added measure of gratitude as House celebrates American Thanksgiving with roast chicken with dressing, tossed salad, mashed potatoes and giblet gravy, broccoli and corn-on-the-cob, cranberry sauce and pumpkin pies with whipped cream and cheddar cheese!

Contradiction: Preparing the winning strategy for marketing and IERD that creates an advantage out of the Eastern traditional proprieties and social forms. (Week 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: The House whirls through a diverse week with a two-day circuit to Iloilo for Academy recruitment introduction to a RSI group meeting which has met regularly since 1974 and their particular project being children to elementary school who otherwise wouldn't go. Twelve parish workshop leaders are trained for Town Meeting in their local parish in an office re-created once again for the arrival of a TRS-80-model two computer from Hong Kong. Contributors luncheon is held with 42 present, all are impacted by project reports and display.

Internal: The House expands visably with the development and finance team from Hong Kong, Vicky Aguirang and Ruz Casquejo for the week to assist in pre-audit work. All are impressed with Mike Hoff's ingenious maneuver with local guide who retrieve computer from customs with minimum expense.

Contradiction: Choosing between braking and steering in a fast moving vehicle racing down a steep hill. (Week 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

We receive five first aid kits fully stocked for five clinics, and promises of help and advice on marketing, bookkeeping systems, and farming techniques for the rock and craft industry and for the farms, all of this during the anniversary of the Patron Saint of Lapu-lapu.

Internal: Four Regions spend five days in Sudtonggan doing the HDZ Lab and using public and private sector sources in Cebu, with J. Telford and C. Cramer arriving to assist. The House preparation includes new decor, utensils and equipment for the Training Center.

Contradiction: Accelerating new program thrusts while maintaining momentum in existing activities. (Week 7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

External: House welcomes Stephen Leanhouts and Hermenia Banayo for a conference on the new budget. The Carmen Quarterly weighing report is sent to MSSD. House staff joins the Inauguration of new Langub Elementary School Building, and assemblywoman Felicedad Santos is a visitor during that occasion.

Internal: House staff changes assignment for every village worker, for greater effectivity in the project.

Contradiction: Consensing on focused action for the Demonstration Farm and to self-support the Pre-School Teacher. (Week 3)

## TOKYO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Mr. Veniboo, Head of UNDP visits the Cheonwon cluster. A team of five travels to SoeSan for health caretaker and nurses' TMs in two locations, with 38 and 33 participants respectively.

Internal: The House celebrates Hannsh's first birthday with a special birthday feast.

Contradiction: Creating the story that allows us to move with available troops.(Week 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-CHEONG WON

External: The House receives a positive answer about the facility for HDZ. The team gets leaders' approval and agreements in four villages about the need for initiating the DOOP Model, and celebrates with four village Ri Chiefs and Sae Maul leaders.

Internal: The House has a celebration on Thanksgiving Day with the village youth.

Contradiction: Building a clearly targetted necessary mission in the cluster to build a sense of something established before we move into Cheong Ju city.(Week 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Bob Hanson and Shizuyo Sato are sent out to Okinawa to do five meetings. Joyce Reese and Junko Kondo, Resident Volunteer, work on next weeks' circuit to Southern Kyushu, the first in two years. Our first Think Tank actually works. A fine day ends with variations on an American Thanksgiving Day feast using only a few substitutions for traditional food. (But no Sumo Match can ever replace American Football!)

Internal: Advent House Church helps us remember our roots as House Members affirm 'all is good' including Chicken Pox, Allergy and Sherine James sudden trip to the hospital for an Appendectomy. (She's recovering nicely). Jean Hanson is featured in CITY PARK, a Fukuoka City magazine, with two page pictures and story about her, the family and the ICA.

Contradiction: Taking December a step at a time remembering all the details for at least six major events. (Week 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: A full two weeks includes five major events: Languaghe Lab in Tokyo, Future Trends Seminar (Participatory Polity Think Tank), Two Team Leader Treining Sessions, and a Big Thanksgiving Party with 41 "gobbling up" three turkeys, dressing and all the fix'ins. Three Xmas parties are scheduled and invitations printed, as work on the mailing continues and 10 of 20 are committed to pay annual member's fee.

Internal: On the financial front, Alexander Tonosaki receives his first regular Japanese company salary check and Teresa Butcher models for TV, as 90% of budget deficits is secured.

Contradiction: Finalizing many almost completed plans and decisions. (Week 8)\*

## SYDNEY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: The dam breaks in all directions this week with LENS affirmations and set-ups in Sydney; the PTS Task Force arriving from Tonga for funding; IERD Task Force writing a brief on Area Sydney participation; Region Priors coming in for a check signals, and Self Support Ventures Team mailing up their shingle "MICROCONNEXIONS".

Internal: Order guests from Hong Kong, Tonga, Melbourne, Murrin Bridge and Regional Team participate in a lively Roundtable with "Busrides I remember" conversation, and then a PTS presentation by Sina Vaipuna and Ken Whitney from Tonga. American Thanksgiving is celebrated Saturday night with a beautiful turkey and trimmings, Vaoita's birhtday and Stoners' anniversary, George's send-out to Jakarta and Christina's to Perth and Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Orchestrating December and January manoeuvres so that immediate and long-range demands are balanced each week when either could be all consuming. (Week 8)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY-MURRIN BRIDGE

Contradiction: Getting our priorities straight relative to recruitment, curriculum, practics etc. in the time we have left. (Week 7)

External: PTS training/Roundtable research with two national agricultural leaders illuminates the vision, contradictions and accomplishments of the primary economic arena for 40 Tongan faculty in training. Bread for the World proposal for USD10,000 submitted by Dr. Havea on Methodist Church of Tonga stationary. 30 development letters for PTS scholarships are sent by the staff to contacts in U.S. and Philippines. Nau'utoka village meeting has 90 participants, Kalonga village meeting has 35. Local orchestrators lead both meetings. Conversation with Church business manager regrounds the hurricane devastation and need for village development. Four guests attend Roundtable and have a group interview with the 40 participants on teachers and the needs for the future in teacher training and development.

Internal: Hong Kong Nexus phone call shares news and data. Invention of the Order collegium deepens consciousness of Order journey and necessity for keeping the practical vision and future story before. PTS priory collegium with Dr. Havea and director of Village Development for Tonga Council of Churches deepens consensus on the next year.

Contradiction: Creating the revolutionary forms and style that allow us to move in the midst of ambiguity about resources. (Week 6)

**SAN FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Roundtable in Wilkesbore and Raleigh and Leadership Training in Richmond Co. N.C. expose 60 people to methods and strategic thinking. Jasper Mills LENS is completed in Lambertson N.C. with two Regional Teams.

Internal: Mary Lou's self-support of 63 hours this week enables the Jarkarta trip.

Contradiction: Building in the flexibility needed to set up futuric self-support and development models in the midst of ongoing marketing and self-support work. (Week 9)\*

**CHICAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Mid America Symposium framing and sponsorship is highlighted by encouraging visits with the mayor of Independence, Mo. and the pastor of one of the largest Protestant congregations in the U.S. Maneuvers and timeline for Westport School community round-up signals new edge of mission.

Internal: Thanksgiving is a great family event as well as a Regional celebration with 46 around the table followed by frisbee football, launching four days of events including movies, pool games, a punk rock dance with four phases participating, and ending with a fine House Church and witness by Greta Hanson.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External The Woburn Lawn Co-op and ICA host a Multi-purpose Cooperative Think Tank in Woburn Lawn with 30 participants from the four sectors focused on Sub-Cluster Co-op formation. Forty village leaders attend the Cluster Leaders Meeting in Woburn Lawn for reporting and planning of the HDTI. The German Embassy from Kinston and the Canadian CIDA from Ottawa each make a site visit of Woburn Lawn and the Cluster during the week. The joint Rotary/ICA committee meets to plan recruitment of consultants for the HDTI and treks.

Internal: The House welcomes Linda Barnes from Chicago Nexus for the GMC trek and hosts two luncheons for visitors and village guests.

Contradiction: Accelerating up a 60 degree hillside road with two flat tyres, little petrol and weak brakes. (Week 8)\*

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Corporate work days complete the digging of the Training Center foundation while at the same time nine Community Forums are set up and two days of Forum Leadership Training are held. The next phase of the health caretaker expansion is initiated with a visit to a new area health department resulting in an invitation letter to work in a new district.

Internal: Budget projections for O:E and ICA are completed in preparation for the Continental Meeting. We celebrate Stuart Farrar's 15th birthday.

Contradiction: Taking the time for spirit reflection so we don't get consumed by the practical tasks. (Week 8)\*

## CARACAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Religious community cultivated continues with great calls with Jesuits and INCE Iglesia. The inkind campaign accelerates with the beginning of school in Cano Negro.

Internal: Preparation of a gift of JWM writings as the birthday gift to Jamil Dunia is an address on the whole House.

Contradiction: With the Health Trek and the IERD Trek here and in Columbia, and school beginning: it's hard to believe it's efulgence and not too much. (Week 6)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: A whirlwind of activities, including 122 people contacted for the IERD, welcomes the Lindsays for two days in Chile. Sixty-five attend a reception at the home of the British Consul and thirty-five attend a reception given by the Holiday Inn. The Advisory Board members from Chile have said they are 'honored to serve'. The Lampa Alcalde (district mayor) and his wife attended both receptions and with fear and fascination have said 'full speed ahead on Lampa'. A foro pedagogy in Sol de Septiembre brings forth new interest in the training methods and the additional participation of three men.

Internal: A fine celebration at the Adobe Restaurant sends the IERD team on its way with a great sample of Chileno food and folklore dances. Roundtable is highlighted this week with participation from Sol colleagues in dialogue with colleagues from Santiago over John Naisbitt's Megatrends: Ten New Directions Transforming Our Lives.

Contradiction: Facing the unlimited possibilities resulting from recent activities without a concrete plan of action. (Weeks 6&7)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: The week is dominated by Brazil's first national elections since 1964. Set-up for the Lindsay visit Week 9 continues to progress well with the inking of three rooms for four nights at the Rio Sheraton Hotel. In Rio Bonito, five families are selected to be demonstration families for implementing basic health and hygiene programs, and a veterinarian is added to the municipal team. Rio guardian and officer of Commercial Association agrees to host IERD luncheon with top business people to attend. A graduation celebration marks the completion of the crochet course for 15 girls in the community of Bracana. Many crocheted items have been produced for use at home or for sale as a cottage industry.

Internal: Two churrascos (BBQ'S) on election day weekend help prepare the House for the end of the year push. House experiences the helpful discontinuity of global Fast day and reflective exercises; and terminates the event with grand churrasco.

Contradiction: Scheduling a time to do 1983 keystone visioning before Christmas. (Weeks 6&7)

External: IERD visits begin in Guatemala with visit to United Na

## GLOBAL NEXUS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: The HD-2 trek is launched with a special send out.

Internal: The Fast Day and its reading ground the social reality of care in the HDZ.

Contradiction: Discerning the Continental whistle points to focus the IERD thrust across Europe. (Week 7)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: A "face-saving" turn around with West German consular staff results in the plan to not only retain the existing grant but to offer to receive new proposals amounting to at least Rs 80,000.

Harold Naylor and Father Ovay Mahommed S.J., who was responsible for the dialogue with World Religious, Regis College, London to Canada.

Contradiction: Castalyzing recruitment to ensure the first GRA comes off with power and in style. (Week 8)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Evening with the Institute includes a site visit and conversations about sojourning or volunteer opportunities with five people. Horizons Unlimited opens its doors with a Nexus collegium and begins to purchase its own tickets. The first two IBM Personal Computers arrive intensifying the computer conversion timeline.

Internal: The week is bracketed by the celebration of life in Dolores Morrill's 50th birthday recital and the celebration of the completed life of Ellen Risky.

Contradiction: Daring the tension between the impingement of both planned-for discontinuous shifts and unplanned encounters with final limits in the never ending task of caring for the globe. (Week 9)

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that the IERD moves front and center in all locations as special Task Force is set up in Chicago Nexus. The death of Ellen Risky provides the occasion for rethinking another dimension of our ritual life. Academy moves into decisional week with great International Open House. IERD and Rural Development Symposium are seen as steps towards the initiation of HDZ in all locations as comprehensive focus of our futuric mission. ## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

A two day economic development module was integrated with the practicum which had significant participation from the zone. 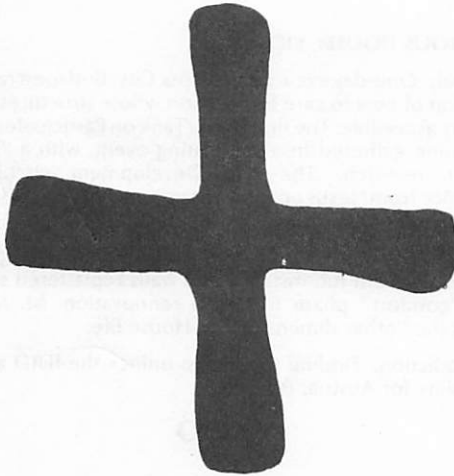
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: The university in Vila Real assigns a research intern to ICA for six months to start sheep demonstration and to live in the House. Branganca to follow-up meeting yields a plan for 10-village implementary meetings in January. A great week of local events and structural collaboration victories with seven film shows in seven villages, two Health Fairs and two children's health events. The Bishop volunteers four priests' houses in rural villages for the ICA staff to live in. Collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture comes one step closer with Regional director bringing financial assistance and the next step planned to pick agricultural demonstration villages within the Cluster.

Internal: Eneida and a friend from Brasil confirm their presence at HDTI. A Roundtable with the House prepares for Christmas by putting up a tree and wreath; and for Hortensio and Jeronima's wedding with a House congregation celebration. Fosters and Lockmans from USA arrive to launch village health month, Paul and Christine leave for Brussels Council and local nation-wide Portuguese elections happen at the same time.

Contradiction: Getting up health events in villages with elections and Christmas prep going on at the same time. (Week 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Eight days of G.C.F.s are done in six villages of the Comarca of Ariza in the Province of Zaragoza, ending with a fine assembly of all six villages. Also, full imaginal leadership training sessions were done each day for the local team, all in Spanish. Spain's two Global Advisory Board members were visited and updated. Barbara and Lucy finish up the second set of seven villages (13 in two weeks) with a grand assembly in Branganca, Northeastern Portugal.

Internal: Maria Fry and Bill Alerding return from exciting Ariza (Zaragoza) meetings and begin pulling together an Imaginal Education training document for Spanish translation. They also bring a huge box of almonds as a gift from a local Ariza team. Mary Kaye returns from her 3 week European trek for Ohio's Wittenberg University while Sara Lilja prepares for her trip to the Lamego HDZ empowerment trek.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The Glasgow circuit is completed with visits to old colleagues and new N.S.C. possibilities in addition to calls for W.H.O., LENS, and Volunteer Service Programme. A 15 person Volunteer Orientation Weekend is held with ten who indicate a readiness to continue with the programme as volunteers to the Third World. A budget is submitted to the Laing Construction Co. for the 7,000 already committed for the El Bayad project.

Internal: The House operates with its smallest number since September hosting an equal number of guests on study night, celebrating Thanksgiving American style, and maintaining relationships with inkind vegetable market and bread merchants.

Contradiction: Using the HDZ Event as an occasion for putting a focus on multiplication of options in the external mission. (Week 8)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Team sends out the newsletter with a striking drawing of the photograph of two women (from India brochure) in a gesture of mutual respect, a symbol for the IERD. The House creates broad outlines of a nine month house hunt strategy. A team studies the effects of computers on society.

Internal: M. K. Soderlind's visit, though short, brings significant sharing on IERD support in Spain and brooding on the life of the Order.

Contradiction: Strategically enlarging the nation's steering committee of the IERD. (Week 5)

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Events keep the Training Centre busy every day: Third Wave Study, Women's Studies, Teachers' Meeting, Social Change Think Tank, HDZ - RSP.

Internal: Lieve, Herman, and Kenneth turn carpenter and build a collegium table for twenty, giving elbow room and space for dinner guests. Bob Gilbert's slides provide a 'laugh-in' evening and myths fill our Going Sane evening.

Contradiction: Getting the wheels (like money) under the missional vehicle now that the engine is racing. (Week 7)

**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: The National Steering Committee meets at the House. Two Think Tanks are scheduled for Quarter III in Hamburg and one in Berlin which relate to the Brussels GRA. Marketing begins in Berlin with possibilities for engaging youth and Vietnamese.

Internal: Seventy-five people attend an Advents Open House including a lady who lived in the House from 1944-1977. The Stringham family has an open house for House members to announce their own advent.

Contradiction: Creating the time design which honors the need for Advent reflections while experiencing the abundance of breaklooses for Quarter III. (Week 9)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Participant list grows to 21 with all sectors represented as the House gears up for the IERD luncheon meeting. The Polity Think Tank pushes us and colleagues "to do our homework". The IERD is introduced to the Netherlands with a luncheon which hosts 19 people. A circuit to the town of Sniek introduce the IERD at the local level and a circuit to Den Haag allow us to deal with the issue of national authorisation. Volunteer gathering produces a group of four who want to do training together.

Internal: Renu Blick and Tim Vogel arrive to begin their training to volunteer in Portugal. The House rehearses the seminar method in the Ortega and Sagan study. Volunteer sojourners' training intensifies with a depth look at the artform as it is expressed in the conversatina and charting methods and includes practical experience in revitalizing the House facility as they turn an attic storeroom into a useable lounge and operate successfully on a broken heater.

Contradiction: Following through with Regional Maneuvers when events set context beyond expectations. (Weeks 9,10)\*

**ROME****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: An HDZ Regional Strategy Practicum was held with six of the Regional Team and Lit. 1.5M(USD 1,000) was received from the Augustinian Fathers.

Internal: Caritas has approved Lit.5M in scholarships for the SEM ensuring self-support. Fasting and Feasting celebrates this self-support victory.

Contradiction: Heating up of the mission has rendered the complexity of practices disabling. (Week 8)

**STOCKHOLM****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: The working group on urban housing is surprised during a ten day practicum by projections that 30% of the future work force will probably operate from their homes with computer terminals, demanding a new perspective in urban housing. Top level appointments are set up with W.H.O., for a new round of negotiations. The team working on "youth in development" has project brief ready for printing.

Internal: For the first time this year, self support breaks through into the black by Nov.30th, and the House celebrates with a wine and cheese party and movies.

Contradiction: Creating the procedures and gathering information for a final Urban Housing working group to be ready for the documentation of the first of nine sectors of the urban research project. (Week 8)

**BUDAPEST****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: One-day excursion to Area City, Budapest raises the question of how to care for a nation whose structures are not directly accessible. The first Think/Tank on Participatory Polity finds nine gathered in a stimulating event, with a "Yes" to further research. The IERD/Development circuit with assistance from Nexus opens some new possibilities with youth networks, the money and frame.

Internal: The last two rooms fully electrified, gas line connected, bath tub installed and walls replastered signals a new "comfort" phase in House renovation. M. Maguire brings the "other dimension" to House life.

Contradiction: Finding the key to unlock the IERD as a real possibility for Austria. (Week 8)

**CAIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE GIZA — EL BAYAD**

External: The HDZ Trek enables visitation to villages in Beni Suef, Markaz. The Director of the Village Development Department assists in visits as well as assigning his staff to be part of the Teams. Visit from Dutch Embassy to Bayad results in her asking for a proposal. The first Arabic brochure is printed with technical assistance from GE and Conoco. The USAID consultant and his wife visit Bayad and are addressed by local participation in project work. A workshop with Markaz (HDZ) Director of Village Development and LOC village unit Government inspectors indicates the first HDTI will have strong Government participation.

Internal: Hosting HDZ Team is highlighted by creating a two year HDZ plan, celebrating three birthdays, and Join Said Riskalla in celebrating his engagement.

Contradiction: Creating plans and systems that guarantee HDTI beginning in six weeks when next four weeks include Western Christmas, Prophets birthday, Coptic Christmas, and participation in two global events. (Weeks 10,11)\*

**ABIDJAN****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Phase I of health surveys, animal disease research and exploration into exporting industry is launched and Phase II of the village re-entry meetings and centre installation is begun. The Director of the National Centre for Economic and Social Research agrees to be on the ICA Board.

Internal: New team member, Marie, an Ivorian woman who speaks Baoule, gives the team a new facet and added advantage in village health surveys.

Contradiction: Discerning what is necessary in the arena of economic development in order to break open markets while also speeding up the momentum of programmes in progress. (Week 7)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Visits to key guardians strengthen IERD and the second meeting of the IERD National Steering Committee is hosted. Development nets another \$1200 to put on top of last week's largest week of \$5600US. A quick trip to Benin City sets up the follow-up on village cooperatives with the Nigerian Rubber Board.

Internal: House participates in a newsletter mailing blitz as Quarter III vision and planning takes shape. Bells pack for their visa reentry trip to Abidjan and Lee Ferguson wraps up four years of work as he packs for London. Strategy collegiums are capped off with a great 'poverty' muse. The House experiences a great week of collegiums on Research Think Tanks and Order Principles. ICA belongings are moved to new office outpost in Ikoridu in preparation for Lagos House relocation in Orlu in December.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the details of finances, development, communications and IERD so that momentum is maintained on all fronts. (Week 7)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: One diamond of Zambia village brings 30 bundles of grass to complete the preschool building roof. Zimbabwe IERD Team reports great success and brings Justin Dole, Zimbabwe farmer, to visit the Kapini HDP. Thirty-nine primary children and adults from the Swedish School work in eight teams for two days; many experience their first exposure to authentic Zambian life. Receive from Bata Shoes 1060 USD and ten pair of shoes.

Internal: Charles Lingo, Elisha Odari and Margie Tomlinson are welcomed. Fiscal report of 17 August-30 November is sent to Global Management: Brussels. The House is refreshed by grounding the HD-I talks and conversations on the Zambian experience.

Contradiction: Raising 20,140USD to meet debts and the immediate demands of December and January. (Week 9)\*

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Seventy-five village leaders representing 202 villages gather for a three day Village Leaders Conference to report on accomplishments, dialogue on leadership qualities and receive training on Bio-intensive gardens. The Honorable Charles Njonjo, Minister of Constitution Affairs becomes the fourth cabinet minister to serve on global IERD Advisory Board. Mr. F.Y.O. Masakhalia permanent secretary, Ministry of Economic Planning and Development agrees to be an honorary chairman of Natinal Steering Committee. The roof is inkinded as fourth HDTI building nears completion.

Internal: Week preceding Jamhuri (independence) Day finds the House welcoming Judi White, Kay and Dara Schnizlein enroute to Zambia, Gautum from Chonyi impact all during redecoring the collegium room and planning December.

Contradiction: Initiating December Councils while building the models.(Week 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KABIRO

External: A great finish to a great year as the Kabiro unusual Learning Center is completed in a year, graduating 138 from three nursery classes, 323 from Standard 7 while 31 received certificates for Adult Education Studies. The closing celebration is interrupted by three site vidits.

Internal: Receive back three Auxiliary from the Impact Week and send out George Black to a new assignment in the New York House.

Contradiction: Finishing the three room addition before Kabiro residents and Auxiliary disappear back to their home villages for Christmas. (Week 9)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: The Section House sends out a team for two weeks to Samutet to train village health caretakers. Four circuiters are on the road setting up for Kakemega three saturation, Hawenga and Kutuni Sub-locations consults. Evaluation of health and agriculture training of auxiliaries and village volunteers for Ford Foundation Grant continues.

Internal: Kenyatta Day celebrated near the new project site visiting Kapenguira Prison where Kenyatta was detained, the event marking the beginning of the Mau Mau.

Contradiction: Discovering ourselves in the midst of many programs and over extended again. (Week 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-MUGUMOINI

External: A full House once again as we receive Ngutu auxiliaries, Sharyn Roberts and Daniel Ndolo for the Kaptel VLI and Fiona Knisman.

Internal: We finish the Ngutu consult but fail with the Kaptel VLI, as the Kaptel villagers are invited to dance for President Moi on Jamhun day. Fifty people attend a workday on the Mugumoini community centre (the walls are now 3' high). New development committees are selected in each sub-location of the Muthithi location.

Contradiction: Gathering the picture at the real situation to release the expansion of our programmes to two locations next quarter. (Week 10)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA-KAMWELINI

## AREA BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA

External: Sent the Mahila Mandal proposal total RS 2,50,500 to the State Social Welfare Board in Poona for three villages in the Maliwada Cluster.

Internal: Two most important collegiums well done by D. Kolankan on the Public Sector Actuation Style and the banking loan structure.

Contradiction: Engaging local people in ICA programmes. (Week 9)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—CHIKHALE

External: The Cluster TF catalyses the sewing class invitation in Wangui; hosts site visits from New Bombay Rotary Club and from a top Bombay lawyer. Ashram women's team heads meeting with 50 women leaders from the Panvel Block villages in the office of the Block Development offer to plan preschool infrastructures for the Block. Thirty primary school teachers from the cluster attend a one-day Imaginal Education Module. Priorship team confirms the saga of the Grab Training Centre land transfer legalities. Guardian contractor redoes the Training Centre construction timeline and delivers steel and concrete for the walls.

Internal: The Ashram participates in the Area Bombay fast, using new fasting context; creates a sparkling new imaginal profound humanness chart for the collegium room, redoes the collegium centrepiece structure, beautifies Ashram approaches with whitewash and "Chikhale is the great place to be alive" sign. House collegium unfolds new slants on the HDZ/Block strategy.

Contradiction: Using upcoming events to catalyse new spirit in the Cluster and Block. (Week 9)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—VAVIHARSH****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—JAWALE**

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (This is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Establishing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actuation. (Week 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—MAALE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—BUDHODA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—SEVAGRAM**

External: Two exciting possibilities for Cluster Industry are revealed and 30½ metres of cloth inkinded. Mr. R.K. Patil, retired Chairman of (Central Gov't) Planning Board, and a member of Gandhi District Committee, makes an RS 101 donation.

Internal: House celebrates the completed life of Ellen Risky.

Contradiction: Structuring local initiative and responsibility. (Week 9)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—TEMBURWAHI**

External: The Anganivadi (Child Development) Program is launched in seven villages with immunization of 400 children, preschool equipment and daily Sukvi (nutritious food) distribution. Applications are lodged by 30 villagers for gobar gas plant, poultry units and dairy cows to I.R.D.P. Sirci meeting completes the Cluster Quarter plans, gravel fill is inkinded and steel purchased to begin Gandhi statue construction. Bhedoda women elect first "Mandal" executive. Invitations to the Village Leaders Institute are delivered to 11 villages. Rajura Block Gram Sevaks participatte in demonstration Gram Sabha.

Internal: The Neware family from Dabhad and Manda Taksande from Sevagram(HDTI) arrive at their new assignment: Guest Charles Jago journeys Ashram through profound "Participatory Polity" Think Tank followed by a past-inkinded feast and movie. Rajura guardians Effi and Mary David are Roundtable guests. Influx of E.G. pushes us to create E.G. curriculum and space.

Contradiction: Creating winning framing/authorization, inkind and actuation models and revitalizing internal reporting formats. (Weeks 8,9)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—DABHAD****DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: The Haryan State Development Minister hosts the Cluster Team for half a day in a cluster authorisation visit. Invitations to Cluster Consultation are printed and mailed, and the Ccluster circuit visits all village leadership to inform. Lease is signed for an excellent 26 room HDZ building. Rs.5000 (U.S. 500) material inkinded for renovation work which begins with Wk.II white washing workday. Contradiction: Refocusing the programtic tactics to accomplish the strategies in responce to the new situation. (Weeks 9,10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: In spite of the floods, Mary Smith and Phyllis Slicker circuit Arkansas. Twenty-one RDS Steering Committee letters and 12 letters to Area Houses are sent out. After 14 appointments, we have \$550 in hand.

Internal: The House receives several guests-two men from the UNited Methodist conference come to breakfast; Phyllis Slicker arrives for circuiting; and the Youth Trek comes, bringing spice for the spirit life, laying carpet, and celebrating with homemade pizza, drinks and blueberry pie. (Week 9)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Mary Lou Peterson goes to Jakarta as the representative from the Houston Area. The PMA in Gainesville, Ga. concludes with a champagne celebration. The Miami circuit includes attendance at open House for the New Directions Day Treatment Center which reveals successive use of methods from the Imaginal Education Course and effective treatment of patients.

Internal: House receives a Christmas tree, oranges and rum from the Miami Circuit which is the highlight of the week's celebration, celebrate Dick Sims' birthday.

Contradiction: Getting a clear image of time demands of development marketing, self-support, facility remodeling and holiday events in order to prioritize and claim the week's victory. (Week 10)\*

**CHICAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Mid America Symposium framing and sponsorship is highlighted by encouraging visits with the mayor of Independence, Mo. and the pastor of one of the largest Protestant congregations in the U.S. Maneuvers and timeline for Westport School community round-up signals new edge of mission.

Internal: Thanksgiving is a great family event as well as a Regional celebration with 46 around the table followed by frisbee football, launching four days of events including movies, pool games, a punk rock dance with four phases participating, and ending with a fine House Church and witness by Greta Hanson.

Contradiction: Shifting into high gear for Youth Symposium and other external tasks. (Week 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR**

External: The Midcrest Symposium is the first pull together of people from eight counties of the Midwest to build a consensus on the future. Calling produces 13 church visits and five offerings out of village adoption program. Three LENS proposals are favorably received. Four calls for access to the future produce one immediate indication or sponsorship and \$5000 from Pioneer Seed Co. One hundred and fifty letters were sent out as follow-up to the Midcrest Symposium and the Christmas swirl reveals three interns/sojourn prospects in Santa Claus's stocking.

Internal: Marcus, Jaya Salve and children Rose and Anigetta arrive from Taiwan and the development team arrives for new maneuver increasing the House from five-thirteen!!

Contradiction: Maneuvering strategically to focus the diverse momentum covering all the bases while everyone wants to do development. (Week 10)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: A week of completions and beginnings as a strategy session concludes the RVI contract for seven "Family Farm Workshops"; the last session of LENS for the Hubert Humphrey Institute at University of Minnesota is held; curriculum building begins in earnest for the College of St. Thomas "Team Management" grade course; and a two-week "Sneak Preview" House Training Program is launched with a "Sunset-to-Sunset" session on Friday and Saturday.

Contradiction: Making a priority of naming and celebrating past victories when the future is pulling us in 50 many directions. (Week 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO**

External: Signing the contract with the equipment suppliers for the Auto Center was cause for a high celebration for the Industrial Promotion Board dinner at the House. The third decade coordinating team met with all present, to plan a campaign to canvas 1000 5th citizens. The Fifth City Methods Auxiliary worked on workshop methods and are planning to publish a methods manual.

Internal: Ellen Rissky's funeral was a high celebrative event as the House reflected on her intern year in 5th City, Lela Mosely represented 5th City as a liturgist, and we all experienced the celebration of our own deaths.

Contradiction: Structuring the pre-Christmas and Quarter III configurations to release the 82-83 strategies. (Week 10)\*

External: Development takes the spotlight with calls on Foundations, Corporations, and Religious Groups resulting in encouraging invitations to submit proposals in the \$2,000 range. House families blitz mailing to friends and family for Christmas gifts to Human Development.

Internal: The contingency of all things dramatized as automobiles, heating boiler, and disposal break down. A gas meter is relocated and a new security light installed.

Contradiction: Getting clear that absolution is not so much being the center of attention as attending to the center of being. (Week 10)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: The funding mailing is sent to nearly 100 Regional contacts. Advent celebration in Albany Metro brings together a diverse group of 22 ranging in age from five to 70 to reflect on preparation for Christmas.

Internal: Sharing Thanksgiving with family and students brings Chinese reflection on the Mayflower Compact. Sharon Rafos visits for the Thanksgiving holiday.

Contradiction: Turning funding activities into dollars in hand. (Week 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.**

External: Trek to Norfolk Metro initiates program marketing towards a community planning event in Chincoteague, Virginia. The Regional Team focuses on recruitment of upcoming RS-I and HD-I.

Internal: Procession through the whole facility signals the first Thanksgiving celebration in the new House.

Contradiction: Winning the race against the "Holiday Mindset" by emphasizing eventfulness to do the mission for next five weeks. (Week 8)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Relations with Azpitia HDP deepen as Carl and Elinor Stock, Kathryn Guerty, and Bonnie Heldeman commit to a January trip to Peru as enablers for a work project with the Peru Team. Two luncheons, one for agency representatives and one for Board of Advisors which was hosted by colleague Jeff Coolidge at the Parker House, builds city-wide support for Training, Inc. A planning Forum with Executive Board of Boy Scout Council results in an invitation to come back next year.

Internal: The Youth Trek happens in the midst of a busy Week 11 and Cluster appreciates the 10-year timeline workshop and help on college research. A Great Thanksgiving weekend involves Starks and Boston Houses and regional colleagues and includes traditional procession, Daily Office and Feast followed by an Order Day on Friday on history of Boston Region (1962-1982) and weekend of discontinuity.

Contradiction: Meeting the bottomlines of the North America Stand! Manoeuvre this week--next week is too late! (Week 9)\*

Lorne story is told by Sheighlah Hickey to participants at Habitation Jeanne-Mance in the HD-I course, while continuous Religious Order development carries on.

Internal: Marge celebrates 48th birthday with inkind of 100lbs of flour, 15lbs of rice, hamburger and fish respectively while an advent wreath appears in the Daily Office room. House and colleagues journey to Ottawa to participate in impactful VJL. Houses Reps. stay on for Area planning Prior to upcoming Brussels meeting. Meanwhile electricity fails at House in Montreal with temperature plunging-calling for emergency measures...

Contradiction: Experiencing that the local situation grounds us in the basic struggle of rituals of reconciliation over against suspicion. (Week 10)\*

## MEXICO CITY

External: Meeting with UNDP Rep enables greater clarity on IERD roles, questions of timing and strategy, and the statement by Mr. Silva-Arranda that the IERD has come at the right time for Mexico. Internal: Linda Vernooy's job ends at the bank with the project delivery as House seriously explores English Language teaching options.

Contradiction: Finding Continental Council monies when income resources are severely restricted for months to come. (Week 9)\*

Contradiction: Completing the Forum mandate as our fountain of contacts slowly dries up. (Weeks 8,9)\*

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

Internal: A whirlwind of activities, including 122 people contacted for the IERD, welcomes the Lindsays for two days in Chile. Sixty-five attend a reception at the of of the British consul and thirty-five attend a reception given by the Holiday Inn. The Advisory Board ahead on Lampa'. A foro pedagogy in Sol de Septiembre brings forth new interest in the training methods and the additional participation of three men.

Internal: A fine celebration at the Adobe Restaurant sends the IERD team on its way with a great sample of Chileno food and folklore dances. Roundtable is highlighted this week with participation from Sol colleagues in dialogue with colleagues from Santiago over John Naisbitt's Megatrends: Ten New Directions Transforming Our Lives.

Contradiction: Facing the unlimited possibilities resulting from recent activities without a concrete plan of action. (Weeks 6&7)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: The week is dominated by Brazil's first national elections since 1964. Set-up for the Lindsay visit Week 9 continues to progress well with the inking of three rooms for four nights at the Rio Sheraton Hotel. In Rio Bonito, five families are selected to be demonstration families for implementing basic health and hygiene programs, and a veterinarian is added to the municipal team. Contradiction: Scheduling a time to do 1983 keystone visioning before Christmas. (Weeks 6&7)

External: The Continent is engaged in discerning the necessary event (re/Council) as preparation for participation in January Global meeting and launching the next six months.

Internal: House celebrates Carol Walter's arrival.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from static images re/Council Design. (Week 9)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The Hyderabad Rural Development Symposium is set up for March. Self-support task force sets up first LENS course in January 83'.

Internal: Half of the Nexus is sent out for Development and course teaching. Celebrates Sama's 6th birthday. E.G. goes to Jahur beach for swimming. Kay and Dara leave after a five-day stay in Bombay to their Africa assignment.

Contradiction: Stretching the rubber band so it does not break. (Week 10)\*

Contradiction: Designing the New Wine skin for the Order: Ecumenical that will carry the New Reality of our mission and our beings. (Weeks 9,10)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum Chicago reports the "North America Stand!"-\$650,000 tops \$400,000 and new substantial contributions are received in Europe and Suva. Four reservations for the Global Treks were received. The key contradiction lies in the arena of orchestrating targeted donors to donate in December while objectively assessing the "Market" (givers) situation for a major leap next year.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that GRA Jakarta pioneers in the new Participative Polity. The Area Vocational Journey Lab pilots are completed with a fine weekend in Ottawa Valley. Treks and Think Tanks set the stage for the HDZ, GRA and New Skills Training. All the band focused on the GRA: Jakarta and the reality of a new form of global research. The IERD becomes the main strategic thrust as the step toward two million villages is renewed. An evaluation marks the conclusion of Phase II of the Global Movement Academy. The Bombay audit begins with all ledger entries completed and trial balance run. Brussels reports that treasurer Grant accounting work has been done in Lamego. In Chicago the computer task force moves from its "purging" phase to creating new systems, Scott Morris arrives to do programming, and chart is made showing new personnel files design. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the key moves in order to finish Quarter III.
