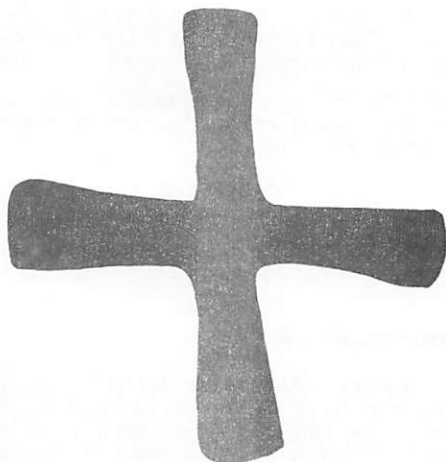

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Lamego circuit model is done for another week with all 10 villages visited. A bus load plus two cars full of villagers visit Ministry of Agriculture's greenhouse experiments in Braga complete with a delightful Portuguese picnic in the mountains. First aid course continues another week in Ferreiros.

Internal: Barbara gives sterling collegium series on learnings for HDZ; coming from Africa Assembly in Kenya, colleagues mob new ICA House for grand opening; and Hortencio, Jeronima and Branca publically ritualize their one-year internship with their parents present.

Contradiction: Responding to the same external demand with only half the number of people. (Wk. 11)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Lieve, Paige and Ruth interview the Department of Sociology at University of Kent to talk about women's studies while Amel and Herman participate in Chestnut House — a local neighborhood activity.

Internal: Team is swirled by arrival and departure of four volunteers as they sojourn before leaving for their Third World voluntary service.

Contradiction: Absorbing energy of a variety of sojourners into rhythm of missional engagement in the midst of a complexity of details. (Wk. 1)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House focuses on public image with day's workshop on writing paragraphs for Area London Annual Report and a statement to the Easterhouse Festival Society's newspaper, "The Voice". Michael Shaw goes to London to meet with four sojourners and work on volunteer programme materials and orientation construct.

*All the while that I, Daniel, was seeing the vision, I was trying to understand it. Suddenly I saw standing before me one with the semblance of a man; at the same time I heard a human voice calling to him across the bend of the Ulai, "Gabriel, explain the vision to this man." He came up to where I was standing; I was seized with terror at his approach and threw myself on my face. But he said to me, "Understand, O man: the vision points to the time of the end."*

Internal: "Surprise" birthday party held for Michael; Sylvia's brother and family spend two days being introduced to ICA; and World Cup Football fans cheer the three British teams.

Contradiction: Finding the spirit to keep momentum going during a week of transition from one year into the next. (Wk. 12)\*

External: Research circuit to Dublin Region involving House and Regional Team is hosted by Sheila Maguire's aunt in North Dublin. Sheila Hickey returns from Dublin in time to catch flight to Lisbon for Human Development circuit in Portugal.

Internal: House hosts Herman Heylans family for weekend discontinuity including village school fete and Lieve's birthday celebration.

Contradiction: Being a two person House for the summer with two full-time jobs and two E.G. to care for. (Wk. 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Round Table with five guests features conversation on interdependence, led off by international businessman who met ICA in his company's LENS in Zambia.

Internal: Continental Council reflects on the last year across Europe and suggests strategic directions for next two years.

Contradiction: Expressing intuitions about the future. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Firming up the decision of the Sisters to sign the contract leasing the building with ownership potential.

Internal: Brussels Nexus House holds the years' celebration that embraces the decision to take real limits and occasion creativity.

Contradiction: Gleaning the learnings from last year in order to sense the keys to next year. (Wk. 11)

Sojourner (volunteer) Paul Weijers is sent out to prepare to go to India. Donations for Joyce's travel fund for Research Council continue to come in.

Internal: An evening of corporate filing of accumulated "stocks" and a surprise party for Roger (with guests arriving early); enliven the House week and make it sparkle with collegiality.

Contradiction: Thinking in terms of one thing at a time when we need to prepare a comprehensive approach. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Sir James Lindsay and Hannerl Golda visit Dr. Professor Dietrich Goldschmidt, who joins the IERD Global Advisory Board and refers them to the German Foundation for International Development.

Internal: Round Table study is led by colleague, with a very late dinner in honor of the Ramadan fast.

Contradiction: Imaging solitary-hood as an exciting experiment with lessons to glean for Religious House style. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: IERD trip with Lady Lindsay to Oslo, Stockholm and Copenhagen results in new authorization, particularly in Denmark. Lis Banks returns from W.H.O. working group on Primary Health Care in Zagreb, Yugoslavia, which changes legislation for community participation in urban planning, hospital services, health centres and environmental research and opens new access to networks in Yugoslavia, Hungary and Moscow. New proposal is created for local urban research funding.

Internal: House youth receives school award; welcome is extended to the Rafos family celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary, and Marianne Baasch joins in weekly evaluation and planning.

Contradiction: Creating timeline which takes advantage of momentum, deals with financial situation, creates major documentation and reports, and at the same time is present to numerous W.H.O. meetings. (Wk. 11)

**BUDAPEST**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Quarter I Manoeuver planning includes new facility search after return from the July Program. Local colleague calls for information on training possibilities for new staff in her Parish.

Internal: House Church a signal event with local Methodist Pastor and wife participating.

Contradiction: Being able to see the big picture in the midst of time consuming immediacies. (Wk. 12)\*

**CAIRO**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Workable systems established in two programs as carpentry shop finishes the fourth week of covering all non-capital expenses from sales and the Bayad Preschool receives first monthly lunch program money directly from Bayad Council social affairs representative.

Internal: Ramadan time design, which gets all teams moving by 7:30 a.m., allowing adequate rest and timelines of all teams working to midnight, is created and implemented corporately.

Contradiction: Dealing with traditional attitudes of distaste for women working outside the home in midst of starting a preschool in a new village. (Wk. 1)\*

Sister Bernadette Okure drops by to reflect on her participation in the Africa Assembly on Local Development, revealing her brooding about how such a construct can be used in a local community. Article, "Ijede Project Grows" in the Sunday Times, and invitation from the Federal Dept. of Agriculture and Cooperatives reveal new readiness of Nigeria structures. Largest ever Lever Brothers inkind gift arrives.

Internal: Olatunji family joins Ijede colleagues in sending out Charles Sanlola to the summer programme and Fall Academy; Muslim leader drops in to give support to celebration.

Contradiction: Sustaining two person action model in the midst of difficulties with the logistics of communication, Visa quota, and village housing. (Wk. 12)\*

**KINSHASA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

External: Entourage of 64 government officials headed by the Honourable Mbilishi, MCC., Canadian High Commissioner and IBM chief are entertained by a crowd of 1,500 villagers as the project participates in the much longed for year closing celebration.

Internal: As most of the House goes to Nairobi for Africa Assembly courtesy of airlines and travel agents, Women's Industry Group prepares feast for 200 people.

Contradiction: Learning in the face of praise how not to develop a complacent mindset but move on towards greater horizons. (Wk. 11)

**NAIROBI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

External: African Assembly for Local Development turns out to be as great an event as expected as the continental dialogue, strategizing and working on a statement of the poorest of the poor opens up the world of the African Continent for us all. AALD influence continues into Area Council as Areas Kinshasa, Abidjan, and Bombay stay for Council.

Internal: The House experiences the coming and going of people as it celebrates with Ramona the completion of two years work in Kenya, the return to Ghana of the 10 colleagues here for AALD and sending out Benedetta Muteti and Julius Mayodi for Global Research Council via Ghana for two weeks of consultation with Regional Team.

Contradiction: After the activity of the AALD and Area Council settling down to pull together implications for Quarter I and next year. (Wk. 10)\*

External: Village Leaders Institute graduates 25 in Bokingtonia Sublocation. Nyakoora Health Caretakers form first Rural Chapter of St. Johns Ambulance Society in Western Kenya.

Internal: Representatives of Section and House are sent to the African Assembly for Local Development in Nairobi and Kamweleni.

Contradiction: Maintaining village leaders' participation in DOOP meeting and programmes during rains and weeding season. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI**

External: 106 Mitaboni Location leaders attend volunteer sign-up meeting on opportunities to work in movement teams. LENS is held for Masii Location officers, a farmers' conference is held in Muputi, and impact set-up begins for the last two locations in the Central Division of Machakos — to expand the project to 203 villages and reach the outskirts of Nairobi.

Internal: House loans most of its beds for the African Assembly for Local Development.

Contradiction: Finding no structural way to coordinate the schedules of four-sector coalition groups. (Wk. 9)

External: *Gram Sabha* team completes 28th *Gram Sabha* after visits are made to 40 Block villages with 1,459 participants in *Gram Sabhas* so far. Highlight is Bhadewade with 110 present and a great feast for the team. Village Leaders Institute is held on June 4th in Jawale with three Block villages in attendance — one did not even hold a *Gram Sabha*; 75 attend with RCF representation and Mr. Shiroher, retired soil conservation officer from Pune, is the keynote speaker. Cluster team completes commercial industry survey in 11 villages and moves on to the household survey. Mahila Mandal Institute completes invitations and meeting design.

Internal: Ashram sends out Amy Jennings to Kenya; Dennis Jennings and the Hancocks arrive back from HDTI; and Ashram has surprise visit from Reemsta family on global honeymoon tour.

Contradiction: Fighting the urge to slow down pace in anticipation of the Council and the monsoon. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE**

External: Women's Assembly held in Herlewadi has 40 present and two village women help lead the session; Halondi has finally received its women's society registration number. Think-tank is held in Herle in ICA member's family house. Maharashtra Agro Industries decide to hold meeting in one cluster village about adoption and proposal is submitted to them for self-support/signboard scheme. Proposal submitted to Warna Sugar Factory finds them very interested in the IERD and considering contribution.

Internal: Collegium series held about next year's assignments pushes all to think about their own and other's journeys, and for two evenings whole House organizes data from the loan survey in preparation for going to the respective banks next week. College graduate visits Maale and announces he wishes to join ICA and will move in next week for sojourn.

Contradiction: Holding tension between village development and human development. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI**

External: Inkind truck brings 3250 bricks for Tembrhurwahi preschool, and 7000 tiles are inkind for the roof. Foundation is started, and Rs.101 are collected from Visapur for Kochi Ambedkar statue. Chichibodi women make plans to get *bajhan* equipment and start sewing class; feasibility study is being done for cluster match factory. Site selection is finished and foundation is dug and laid for Gandhi statue.

Internal: Movemental journey of colleagues moves along as House hosts Dr. Frande to dinner and Bandu dresses the Ashram with Rs.500 worth of blue cloth.

Contradiction: Creating model that will give corporate thrust to individual passions for particular cluster villages and village projects. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD**

External: First actuation circuit to circle village is completed. Team visits Jambrun village for two days; village feeds and houses team. Team holds a *shramdan* to make better drainage around bore well.

Internal: House celebrates start of cluster with a film and dinner in Nanded.

Contradiction: After gaining the villagers' interest, finding we are not able to implement the tree planting scheme due to insufficient information and preparation. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: First ever four-sector and Karnataka-based HDTI ends with commitment from five villagers to launch cluster experiment of caring for the villages around Gunjurpalya in the Bangalore Region. Mr. Narasa Reddy, recently appointed Head of Rural Development for Canara Bank across India, writes glowing report on ICA's Human Development Training Seminar for bank officials. Brahmin social worker from Madras, a recent HDTI grad, offers the ICA three rooms in his family's downtown Madras house as ICA office any time team is in town.

Internal: Ambase Khamble, who has been away from his native Karnataka for seven years, and Kranti Samson, who speaks Kannadda as a fifth language, are given the super ironmen of the year award (feasting, dancing and another assignment) as they complete three weeks of translating for every part of every module for every day of the entire HDTI.

Contradiction: Discovering that previously considered "final objective" is only a beachhead on the coastline of an unexplored and inviting continent. (Wk. 9)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Combined General Electric company of India and Genelec LENS focuses on an effective operation between companies, and ends with drinks with Directors and a firm movement base. The First Education Guild Meeting follows up Imaginal Methods Academy Calcutta (IMAC) and participants are committed to pedagogy and teaching in Quarter II. Advertising agency agrees to do layout in kind of end-of-year report with ICA Timeline.

Internal: The significance of our expenditure comes into focus as we chart the happenings and reflect on the learnings of the past year in a series of collegiums.

Contradiction: Focussing all energy on end-of-year report in midst of continental and local demands. (Wk. 10)\*

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Lee foundations (Singapore) donates 6,400 US dollars. Letter of grateful acknowledgement received for presentation of Sungai Lui paper from committee on agricultural modernization.

Internal: Marsha sent out to assignments task force in Chicago and Rory Gowers arrives from Perth for four weeks of development.

Contradiction: Implementing the structures and models that will build on momentum already present. (Wk. 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Imaginal Education Workshop is held with 54 top educators and trainers from university faculties and various public training agencies. Date is set for site visit to Pulau Redang, the potential project site for cooperative venture with the Department of Agriculture.

Internal: En route guests converge from Manila, Medan, and Ujung Pandang providing several great evenings of collegiality.

Contradiction: Ensuring strategic coverage of development and pending programmes during first half of Quarter I. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Three ICA staff do circuit during fasting month for three-module programs: agriculture, preschool and health and sanitation. Forty houses have electricity in one village, there is road improvement in another, and a new Community Center in a third village.

Internal: House receives sojourn Dr. John Bulley from Australia for two months of volunteering in the District Demonstration Project, and has dinner/movie celebration.

Contradiction: Keeping the internal spirit life generated in the midst of shifting manoeuvres. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Adam Malik has confirmed his acceptance in writing to be on the Global Advisory Board. US \$2,000 comes in from American Women's Association.

Internal: This is great week of sending people out to various directions with Jessica and Durc Rettig, Sherwood, Eunice, and Robert Shankland to Chicago, and Doris Rettig and Elizabeth Neat to the Philippines.

Contradiction: Keeping frame in place while pursuing program advantages and building a sustaining plan for Quarter I. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Certificates for graduating preschool children are distributed to teachers in 10 villages. House staff joins another LKMD (the government's village association for Rural Development) meeting in our subdistrict to lead a reflection on the year and DOOP Workshop. Visit to key guardian, Abdul Lathief, head of the Provincial legislature for South Sulawesi brings request for ICA to train staff of his neighborhood's Institute for Environmental and Moral/Social Improvement by having them live/work/observe/study in Bontoa.

Internal: Ramadan (fasting month for Muslims), Quarter planning and 2 days of discontinuity give this a unique rhythm.

Contradiction: Operating in different modes during Ramadan. (Wk. 12)\*

Symposium panelists responding affirmatively to speaking invitations, and Taipei City Government agrees to arrange for HDTP group to visit during Urban Excursion. Development brings in US\$2,000.

Contradiction: Keeping intensive recruitment push on during final week before start of the HDTP. (Wk. 10)

Internal: House is a global stopover place with visitors from Malaysia, Japan, Hong Kong and USA.

Contradiction: Allowing the urban project vision to be enabled but not determined by the four sectors. (Wk. 11)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: Cluster has Environment Clean-up Day followed by celebrations. Newsletter blitz gets newsletters delivered to all villages and 100 in the mail to other sectors.

Internal: Park Jun Young, Moon Pak Village Chief's son, comes to sojourn for one month, while Park Young Chul leaves to teach in Taiwan and Griffins go to Japan for discontinuity.

Contradiction: Getting the Cluster to tell the story for the future. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Joe Iida, Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Kyushu, speaks to a fascinated group of colleagues at Round Table about the movement's history in Japan. ICA Membership in the Region reaches 18 with a half dozen more ready to say "yes". Mr. Honda, Community Center Director from Ieno Cho near Nagasaki, invites staff to his hotel for a brief meeting during his business trip to Fukuoka. (He is a vital authorization person for future town meetings.)

Internal: Jean and Adia are sent out to the July Program with a lively Thursday breakfast and Miyoka Nakamoto is sent out for a month of visits in Tokyo.

Contradiction: Changing an exercise in research into serious programmatic action. (Wk. 13)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Visits by the Griffin family from Korea, and John Telford from Hong Kong, help to kick off ICA: Japan Membership Drive. Twenty-three potential members are contacted, bringing number of paid members to four. Third World trip participants continue to meet and study the developing world, showing increased interest in furthering their Third World participation.

Internal: Machiko Horiuchi arrives from Sapporo for two week visit, and Deann Lindstrom celebrates her 31st birthday.

Contradiction: Switching to the summer beat with different partners on the dance floor and continuing the momentum of the task. (Week 13)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO**

External: In swirl of membership campaign, the first authentic meeting of senior advisors takes place and campaign occasions profound discussions with others who have previously been passing acquaintances. Volunteer women who secured donation of tables and chairs from the Sapporo city office, also do the hard work of transporting them along with Morihiko Saito. Philippine trip task force prints flyer for next year and secures extraordinary concessions from travel agent.

Internal: Celebration of Rick Pezoldt's birthday as he nears completion of international volunteer year.

Contradiction: Choosing what people can do rather than asking them.

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: A week of concentrated development work results in \$4,000 working, nine proposals written, and \$1,250 deposited.

Internal: Week II includes tour of prospective facilities and dialogue on relation of new facility to programme.

Contradiction: Enabling Regional colleagues to experience a victory and claim it as theirs. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: CYF at Morawa District High School enables Year 10 students to grapple with finding work in the rural. E. Park and D. Rundle lead their first CYF workshops as part of the team.

Internal: Rory Gowers finishes his first term examination, the remnant of the House Team enjoys the film "The Man from Snowy River" and Barbara's 32nd birthday is celebrated with lamingtons and cream.

Contradiction: Getting inside the *real* questions facing education in West Australia through our own data and others. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: \$170 is received in-hand for development and \$400 committed. Six month development projection is created and allows us to see what will be required on the regional level. Dame Nancy Buttfeld completes her position on the National Advisory Board after several years of generous service. . . . Format is created for the China day celebration for next week and letters are sent out inviting colleagues and friends to the house for sojourner weeks.

Internal: Thursday night Round Table is a lively event as we continue working on the Spirit Prowess talking paper and World Challenge collegiums come to a conclusion after an exciting quarter of studying them as a Regional Team.

Contradiction: Releasing ourselves to begin a new quarter in the midst of many loose ends. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Urban probe pull together clarifies the real situation and strategic next steps. House planning for Australian Indian Society's "India Day" presentation reveals new programme edge.

Internal: Inkind bounty; first word back from Margaret Oakley from Chicago July set up team and Round Table at colleague's house indicates that the second week of "Winter magic" was as much fun as the first.

Contradiction: Experiencing the vacuum of troops in the midst of ongoing tactical activity. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: Regional Team holds second half of LENS demonstration with new insights on next year's mission in this region popping up. Bishops complete six-week trek to Adelaide, Whyalla and Sydney for Area meeting, and National Urban Network mid-year laboratory.

Contradiction: Being as radical in visioning the next decade of the Region as historical forces have been radical in imposing drastic changes in the social, economic and cultural life of Micronesia. (Wk. 12)\*

Internal: San Francisco Round Table celebrates a great year with still more new faces around the table.

Contradiction: Creating story of an atom smasher without all the necessary strategic directions in place. (Wk. 12)

Internal: We welcome three-month sojourner Steve Knowlton from Boston, celebrate with Chris Boivin 21 great years, and do enabling collegium on internal life structures.

Contradiction: Straining of individual discipline and internal structure in these chaotic times of directional shifts. (Wk. 11)\*

### **CARACAS**

External: Long awaited MARAVEN cheque for 10,000 Bolivares is finally presented with nine company officials present and a photographer recording the event for publication; bringing total for the week to 11,000 Bolivares. Contradiction: Securing authorization support to break loose major keystones for every village in the Cluster, while continuing with intensive leadership training. (Wk. 10)

External: Four sectors celebrate in grand style the closing of the HDTS and the 4th year anniversary of Sol de Septiembre HDP. Internal: House participates (through wonder of satellite television) the awe-filled opening of *Futbol Mundial* in Barcelona, Spain.

Contradiction: Moving through "no cash" situation to planning for the next great leap on the other side of HDTS. (Wk. 10)

Acceptance to Global Advisory Board is received in writing from Vice President Adam Malik, Indonesia, symbolizing wide affirmation. \$125,000 is received from Rotary International as grant for Jamaica cluster villages. First general support of \$5,000 is received from Phillips Petroleum. The 1981 Annual Report is in hand on second day of Global Research Council. The key contradiction lies in heightened consciousness of year's deadline, which forces focus on targets rather than upon delineation of advantages thereby clouding accuracy of maneuvers.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports on the conclusion of the Human Development Training Program in Taipei, Taiwan which had 15 participants including a large number of university graduates and business-sponsored participants as well as one Korean Buddhist monk. The key contradiction lies in figuring out future directions through the complexity of new ideas.

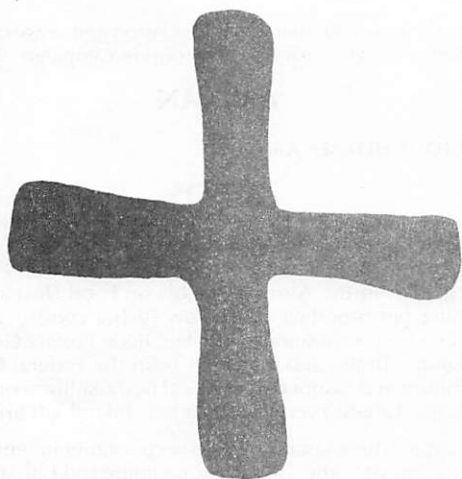
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

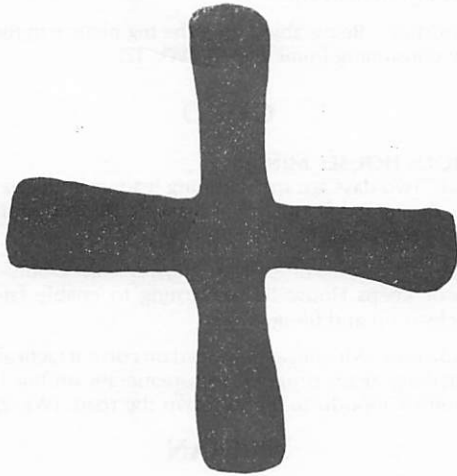

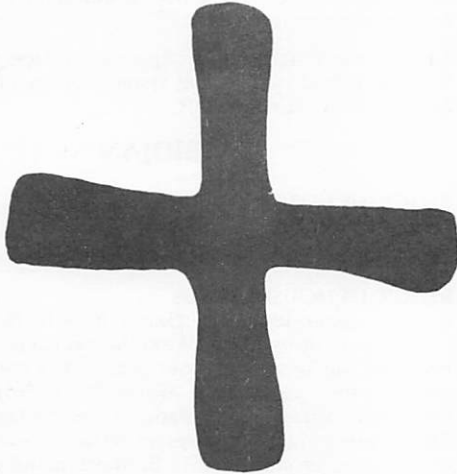

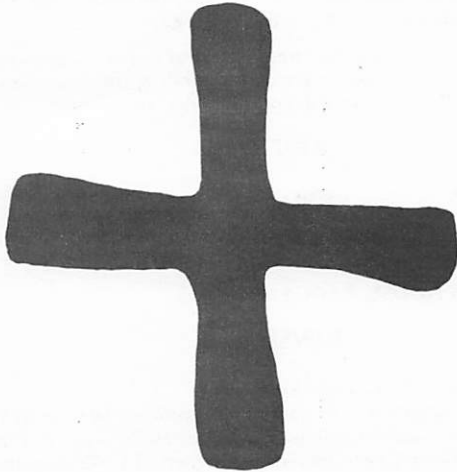

Contradiction: Securing 1982-83 self support and development base now. (Wk. 2)

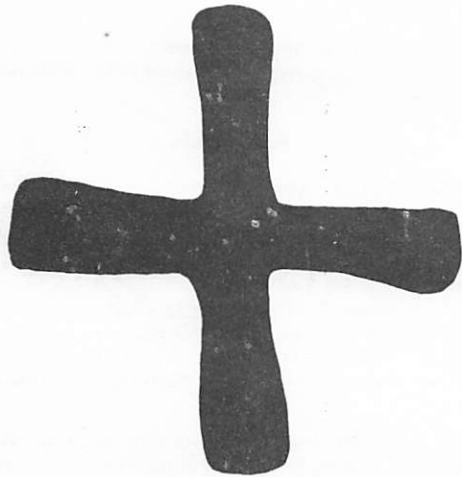
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that in Bombay two surprise donations from Nansee and Ratan Tata Trust net RS2,000, and final approval is received for 35CCA tax exemption after 8 months of manoeuvres. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting major proposals thought through and written while launching individual constituency campaigns across the globe.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

The North American Continental Council reveals resolve to implement Global Research Mechanism through local think tanks and interchange and participation in the 5 GRA's. Centrum positioning takes forms of facility search (Bombay), local relationship empowering (Hong Kong), space transformation (Chicago), and location of translation resources (Bombay). In the midst of NA Council preparation and participation, 30 Academy participants are registered, Roundtable Model is consensed and one half of Day I troops are sent out on Annual Appeal. The key contradiction lies in the arena of walking the razor's edge between immediacy and protracted campaigns, between bright ungrounded ideas and recollected brilliance.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum Bombay reports that training and HDTI recruitment treks plus programme mailings ready the Continent for new momentum. Chicago reports focusing service to the continents through nine bold moves, while the Student House commences the year with 32 students. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding missional advantage while new planning and maneuvering happen.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that Bombay and Chicago Nexus prepare summaries on expenses of last year for the Houses. Resettlement in Management Centruns put us in a new year. Reporting to Houses on finances creates helpful dialogues. The key contradiction lies in the arena of catching up for year end closing.
