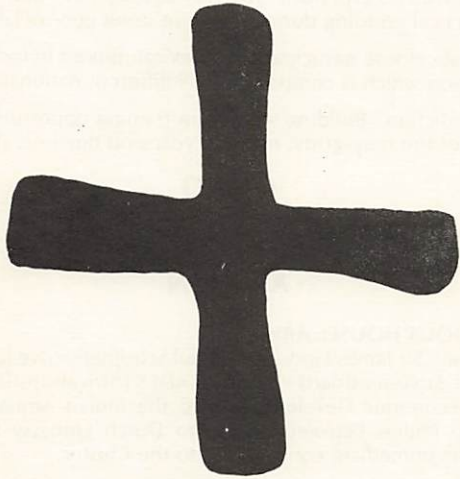

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Meeting with *Comunidad de Navares* of Valencas District raises solid possibilities of Methods Training Academy dynamic and work in the urban. First Madrid LENS is completed with Pfizer Corporation and followed by implementation meetings. Regional guardian begins self-support survey for continent on own initiative, and several hotels donate items for old age residence project in Segovia Cluster.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic keeps everyone and washing machine busy as Jim Kelly and Rose Worden come and go for LENS. Father Ildio and others from Portugal visit during week II, Bill, Luz Marina and Portuguese colleagues pass through from Formation Fortnight to Lamego, and House sends out Maria de Fry to Cluster Consult in Portugal, as Patricia Allan secures additional job teaching English to staff of the Ministry of Education.

Contradiction: Fitting together June programme components before time runs out in a busy May. (Wk. 4)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Leonard Sizer represents House in Area Media Action Task Force, and the circuit of that team finds colleagues ready to respond with their support and advice. Invitations are mailed out for a colleague and guardian dinner/house warming as part of Area Council. New sojourner arrives in time to carry forward preparations for ICA booth at Outdoor Venture Day sponsored by local youth radio station.

Internal: First week in new facility with boxes and odd furniture stacked in every corner proves chaotic with two staff on the road and four with full-time employment, but all is celebrated with a great sunny Saturday in Canterbury which provides an encounter with an age when life did not move with such speed.

Contradiction: Seeing the unclarity in the intent to create a new House. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: ICA Media Response Paper is mailed to 105 regional colleagues and structures, with Bill McKaig providing paper and printing facilities. House attends a special lunch with Glasgow Industrial Society. One more registration for coming V.O.W. (Volunteer Orientation Weekend) arrives from out of the blue.

Internal: House hosts and sends out Media Task Force Team, as delight, giggles and poetry mark first Roundtable of the quarter.

Contradiction: Ensuring that External Mission succeeds with power in the midst of long-term brooding on Internal Life. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Attendance at Conference "The Christian and the Balance of Terror" introduces House to new and old friends in church networks. Computer Training PSU meets for second time with 12 present including youth workers, special education teacher, computer consultant and university students to look at future of programme.

Internal: E.G. visit around village as the residents guess name of soon-to-be borne Royal baby!

Contradiction: Keeping sand out of the works when future is blowing wildly in our faces. (Wk. 7)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Sojourner translates LENS participant manual for June weekend. ICA president invites six advisors to June financial strategy meeting. Team makes 13 contacts with acquaintances from the Rennes Region's GCF campaign.

Internal: Collegium on House space and Development planning meeting with M. Nani, Helen Williams and Dominique Mathiot reveal care for the future.

Contradiction: Creating the appropriate servant role of the ICA in France. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Formation Fortnight ends. Having hosted 102 participants, Nexus moves into Lamego Consult and IERD preparation without missing a beat.

Internal: Nexus moves residence and Centrum offices to new centre; planning for rest of year is done in Week 1 of Week 4, and week ends with celebration and dancing into rest of year.

Contradiction: Getting through the paralysis of "no money" to building a plan for the next six months. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Regional Team meeting in Elst to plan full year calendar of events and check signals on upcoming Board Meeting demonstrates a style of healthy tensional consensus making and creates valuable input for Area Council in Frankfurt the next day.

Internal: House opens doors of the Wayside Inn and welcomes Kathleen Bryant, Denver colleague on her way to Helsinki, hosts three prospective volunteers and welcomes Dutch colleague to *World Challenge* study night and regional collegium, the following morning, on "Theoretics of Social Change".

Contradiction: Being the catalytic presence while trying to grasp what is the new that has been catalysed. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Ascension Day as a national holiday occasions three-pronged area event consisting of research module, methods flea market, and Area Council. Berlin prepares translated *Methods Manual*.

Internal: House takes evaluation of Regional Team and creates 1981-82 report as foundation for next year's planning and invention of new Berlin story.

Contradiction: Creating an imaginal quarter plan that cares for two regions and can be carried out by a permeator in a one-person House. (Wk. 7)

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: A Guestnight series of Leadership Methods Mini-modules is catalyzing interest in corporate methods; two requests for training come in after the second session. Team receives development contribution of Lire 1,440,000. A LENS call at Esso results in scheduling a June presentation with two department heads.

Internal: The new look of the renovated kitchen builds momentum for the rest of the corporate space face lift, and House sends Dan Tuecke to Nigeria for three weeks.

Contradiction: Racing to finish quarter's maneuvers before global demands pull troops away for councils. (Wk. 6)

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Bjarne Nielsen of "Planetary Initiative" visits House and requests workshop methods training and proposes a further meeting with his organization to develop a suitable forum construct. Norad phones to announce a 500,000 kroner (US\$85,000) grant for ICA India. Marianne Baasch returns from Brussels Fortnight and pledges three days per week to House.

Internal: Whole house shows its colours when forced to speak local language at a traditional Danish dinner with folk dancing.

Contradiction: Finding crack in Scandinavian welfare mindset to release substantial funds for first world program. (Wk. 5)

BUDAPEST**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Completion of development circuit nets \$1550. Maneuver planning is done for continuing development and integrated circuiting. Roundtable participants engage in lively muse on an excerpt from "*The World Challenge*" and engage in practical gridding during dialogue using geo-social grid.

Internal: House participates in Mexican dinner in local congregation which is composed of 19 different nationalities.

Contradiction: Building solid team training opportunities in midst of the nitty-gritty, meeting year-end timeline. (Wk. 6)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA****ABIDJAN****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Sir James Lindsay and Paul Schrijnen arrive for IERD Global Advisory Board visits to INADES (African Institute for Socio-Economic Development), to the Indian Ambassador, and to Philips Petroleum. Visit to Dutch Embassy finds a possible immediate contribution to the Cluster.

Internal: Collegium by Sir James on the IERD "macro-picture" is refreshing and helpful to everyone.

Contradiction: Financing participation in the African Assembly. (Wk. 6)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: N 1250 (US \$1875) and three dozen new pairs of shoes arrive from development blitz; the highlight is delivery of two donations to the House, one by guardian Alex Sharta during his participation in the Rafos' send out. African Assembly on Local Development (AALD) is launched with recruitment team visiting Ajegunle, one of the most remote and poorly cared-for parts of Lagos. One hundred slides are expected in Nairobi, fresh from processing by a colleague in Amsterdam, for the Nigeria AALD presentation.

Internal: Dan Tuecke arrives for a month of maneuvers on development, immigration, and AALD recruitment in time to meet Rebecca Nichols on her way into Nigeria from 10-day visit to Abijan.

Contradiction: Focusing attention on events which need to be re-scheduled in order not to lose their potential for the future mission. (Wk. 6)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA****NAIROBI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

External: Two-week AALD (African Assembly on Local Development) count down is accelerated with Week II PSU and report of nine coming from Ghana. The Matha sub-location consult, Village Leadership Institute (VLI) in El Dume, Mitaboni officers LENS, final set-up of two locations to complete central division impact (222 villages), and 108 Mitaboni leaders meeting to plan development around their villages concretize programmatic thrust. Development victories include British American Tobacco gift of K20,000, NORAD II approval of total grant request, and hosting Ford Foundation and Swedish Cooperative Centre evaluation teams.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic comes into full play as 55 HDTI graduates travel to new assignments, Evelyn Philbrook and Linda Alton depart for July Prep Task Force in Chicago and House staff are in and out on LENS, development treks, site visits, evaluations, Zambia foray, and NVM programmes.

Contradiction: Shifting gears to AALD preparation while keeping on top of programmatic thrusts. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: Village circuit participation increases following Tiriki S. Location Consult. Village leaders visit Ministry of Co-operatives about crop marketing and the Ministry of Agriculture about kitchen garden demonstrations. Three people from each House in Section A gather in Kalwani-Shamalago for Section Meeting.

Internal: House repairs begin with cementing and plastering of a room and kitchen construction as tomatoes are transplanted in garden, and House hosts Section Meeting celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring sub-locations honour commitment to provide accommodation for circuiters. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Location Consult set-up proceeds smoothly as over 2500 villagers attend sub-location meeting to select representatives to attend Location Consult. Gathama-Gatira-Ngamburi villages produce 70 people to complete two-year timeline as part of Muthithi Sub-location planning.

Internal: House prepares for Location Consult and District Commissioner's visit by cleaning and redecoring House including the creation of seven sub-location tracking charts which cover one whole wall.

Contradiction: Having undeveloped communication structures and programme realization modes to care for both villages and circuiters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: Eleventh cluster project in the region is launched with consult in Matha Sublocation, Machakos District. Ford Foundation sends team to visit circuits in Masii Location. Local Government Officers LENS is held for 23 from Mitaboni Location.

Internal: Eight more are assigned to Regional House out of the tenth completed HDTI.

Contradiction: Putting necessary priority on training for next quarter's circuit programmes which will involve assigning one ICA staff and a group of village leaders to each sublocation cluster. (Wk. 7)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Nexus troops cover continent with a presence in every region where work is going on. The NORAD grant releases an aura of well-being across the whole House, like rain on desert sand.

Internal: *Shramdan* to paint Phase I room and to make toys brings great week in Phase I Summer Programme to triumphant conclusion.

Contradiction: Discerning the necessary tactics to ensure the success of all current programmes. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: New group of women gather to form registered women's group (easier to get government grants, all castes participating). Insurance money for cow loans from four years ago is broken loose enabling fresh loans. Tractor has new tires and is running after six months idleness.

Internal: Collegium on the how and why of collegiums addresses the House.

Contradiction: Creating the context where people can see the benefit from participating in the cluster. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE

External: Tembhurwahi hosts up to 10,000 people at six marriages and *Dandar* (musical drama). Six villagers receive 150 feet of irrigation pipe each from Tribal Development Project. The Public Works Overseer sanctions new approach road during site visit to Chichbodi. "The three Singhs" colleagues pledge support in the form of inkind brick transport and funds for Gandhi statue and new sewing class machine.

Internal: House hosts D. Holmes and A. Rokade as Management Trek clears haze and balances 10 months of Ashram finances. House celebrates F. Kharat's 27th birthday at the movies.

Contradiction: Creating the strong proposal of cluster keystones that will motivate the four sectors. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Fine site visit by Mr. H. L. Chuganee, Executive Director of Indofil in India and Mr. T. M. Vazirani, resident Director in Delhi and long-time ICA colleague. They are pleased to see the results of three years of input totalling US\$30,000, particularly villages' work on roads and electricity. Team continues to sell advertisements for Sikror brochure and secures assistance of printer and agency. Letter of support for IERD is received from M. S. Swaminathan, Union Minister of State for Agriculture. Villagers from four HDZ cluster villages meet after wedding in Korijamalpur to discuss the future. Programme centre windows and doors are painted. Dinner at managing director's house deepens his family's appreciation of ICA work.

Internal: Bhojar family celebrates eighth wedding anniversary with dinner out and Hindi film "*Shriman, Shrimati*" about marriage.

Contradiction: Releasing people to be present at planned times. (Wk. 7)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: First ever Area Madras HDTI is launched with powerful opening presided over by two village panchayat chairmen. Local village high school is host to HDTI (near Bangalore city), and the powerful mix of 43 villagers, social workers and ICA staff is addressed by life witness of a local farmer who gives the Cooperative Agriculture lecture. Six strong and articulate women from village and social work department are already demonstrating "the south is different".

Internal: Old hands Harry Anthic and A. M. Joseph join the faculties of the HDTI and Calcutta Method's Academy, and inkind tops Rs.25,000 (rupees) in preparation for HDTI.

Contradiction: Saying yes to image shifts that happen to faculty as well as to participants. (Wk. 6)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Team visits 25 schools in four days to confirm registrations for Methods Academy. Next varied programme for Quarter II and Rs.6,000 are working. First meeting of women's guild resulting from Bustee Leader Institute plans regular meetings for methods training.

Internal: In week highlighted by Global Assignment collegiums and "Pass" school reports for E.G., Nexus team arrives for Methods Academy preparation.

Contradiction: Focussing energies in a single event to make the Methods Academy the event of the year. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Nexus signal gives a chance to plan programme schedule for Quarter IV and assignments model for Quarter I. First Australian patron's gift for \$3,000 is received for IERD funding maneuver.

Internal: Nexus planning and scheduling ends with great celebration on the roof with real steak and beer after Nexus participates in volleyball game in House compound.

Contradiction: Getting the implementation details behind the big resolve. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Breakthrough on new government agreement comes as Agriculture Ministry gets Prime Minister's O.K. for ICA to do a project in Trengganu. A series of very key calls is made relative to future program possibilities — United Engineers (LENS); FELCRA (LENS and Human Development Course); Prof. Ungku Aziz, University of Malaya (IERD sponsorship). Visit to Sungai Lui sets the stage for several strategic site visits.

Internal: House celebrates Romanus Wan's 23rd birthday with great celebration including guests from Region and Nexus.

Contradiction: Keeping the heat on development as program activity picks up and a sense of Quarter I discontinuity (shifts in rhythm and troops) creeps in. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Team continues three module programmes, circuit in Kecamatan, two hours for four management training courses held in companies and banks - two for Bir Bintang, one for Bank Buana and one for Overseas Express. Team completes provincial briefing report.

Internal: Medan Region spends two-day holiday over-viewing next three-month picture, with the fourth Roundtable series, "The World Challenge" as the highlight.

Contradiction: Building the vehicle to carry modern technology to the villages. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: National elections happen without incident. Soedjai is pleased with team's speech translation and writing, and he intensifies his yes to giving one person a visa for next year to translate correspondence. Metro visits and a visit to Kelapa Dua are wonder-filled events. Global Advisory Board meeting reveals depth interest and willingness to support and further ICA work by Indonesian Foundation founders.

Internal: House creates new team names — *Garuda* for the E.G. and *Bayu* and *Indra* for the adults — and celebrates end of LENS setup blitz at a Mexican restaurant and with a video viewing of *The African Queen* movie.

Contradiction: Deciding powerful theme for week to enable orchestration of time and engagement of troops. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: After national election quiet presence in Bontoa — with villagers lining the soccer field to vote — Team hits the road with one-day consultation at Tonasa Cement Company and request to submit consultancy proposal; with a one-hour Village Forum under the trees in neighboring sub-district as guests of rural development; and with first meeting with new assistant to the Governor who is very interested in Human Development.

Internal: Joseph McCabe's third birthday on election day brings in friends from Bontoa for cake and songs, and Saturday night chicken celebration is initial send-out for Fumiyo.

Contradiction: Scheduling the quarter victories before the fasting month begins. (Wk. 6)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nexus reports from participation in four regions indicate excited interest in the HDTP, Taipei, and possibility of funding for SEAPAC following Ford Foundation site visit to Sudtonggan. Unexpected gift of HK\$1,000 comes from a newly married couple who wanted to share their wedding gifts with some worth-while enterprise.

Internal: House guests include Robertson Wong, local colleague, and friend with slides from Mainland China and London volunteer Caroline Studholme.

Contradiction: Ensuring victory for the year while forging ahead on key advantages toward next year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Another week of programme calls doubles number of programmes working to ten. Former staff residence on second floor of community centre is turned into ICA office separate from community office.

Internal: House completes journey through profound despair to profound decision as last two boxes of Quarter III Roundtable Journey Chart are filled in.

Contradiction: Finding new avenues for community programmes to replace those disturbed by school examinations and district elections. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: HDTP (Human Development Training Program) recruitment visits are initiated with Chinese Culture University and a Catholic sister in Taipei, while mass mailing goes out to about 200 organizations in Taiwan. President of Taiwan Polypropylene confirms the company's continuing support as a major sponsor. LENS marketing yields positive response from Jacobsen Van de Berg and Singer for in-house consults in August and November, respectively.

Internal: House creates task team assignment configuration organized around HDTP, LENS marketing and development.

Contradiction: Determining where focus needs to be in each of the next six weeks for pulling off comprehensive implementation of HDTP, June 20 to July 8. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Final AID grant check is received and the two-year Sudtonggan evaluation is submitted. 1982 brochure is at the printers; and LENS module for managers from nine nations is held at Citibank Asia-Pacific Training Centre. "Mactan Stone" rock orders exceed Sudtonggan's capacity to produce. Union Carbide sends 500 flashlights for emergency use. Minister of Health, Jesus Azurin, visits Sudtonggan for second time in quarter; and Deputy Minister Rosendo Marquez of MLGCD writes letter affirming Putsan project and expresses interest in attending summer program.

Internal: Sojourner C. Studhomme completes HDP evaluation and travels to Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Finding enough shadows to cover new arenas of work which must be handled by local staff. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

External: Mid-quarter evaluation reveals holding the line on all fronts with significant breakthrough in sewing industry as guild members get loan to purchase new supply of material to fill order from Gaisano's Davao; all six stores report an increase in capital since January. Preschools, with coordination through MSSD, continue nutrition program and a new water pump is purchased for Langub system.

Internal: New face is given staff house as inside of U-shaped compound now has cement sidewalks making rainy weather navigation possible.

Contradiction: Getting sufficient momentum in agricultural programs to significantly increase income in time of low prices for commodities. (Wk. 6)*

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: The Dutch Embassy comes through with \$5,000 for the Cheong Won Cluster. New possibilities emerge from the participation of Diane Greenwald and Phyllis Hockley in a UNICEF planning workshop.

Internal: House is impacted by teenagers as Sara Ennis and Sandy Lanphear pass through on their way home, and Nancy Griffin arrives only to be assigned to a week of study at the National Saemaul Training Centre.

Contradiction: Flipping thinking from creating programs toward accepting some of the possibilities for action. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: Children's Day holiday is fully filled with one team hosting a Cluster Youth Corps event of painting village signs and having a ping pong contest. Another team goes to Seoul for mid-quarter adjustments and planning. Plans are made for Cluster's next "Five Bold Moves".

Internal: House goes to Dae Cheong Dam for send-out party of Sara Ennis and Sandra Lanphear.

Contradiction: Creating maneuvers which honor agriculture schedule and at the same time seeing that projects started get finished. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Okinawa LENS preparation intensifies with possibilities of a fine meeting developing; Imaginal Education on Friday evening is a solid event. Bob and Jean report on a benchmark Advisor's Gathering in Tokyo and a helpful colleague session following. Roundtable party in the park in the rain turns into wild, wet evening with lots of laughter and eight guests.

Internal: Collegium led by Miyoko Nakamoto on House's local neighborhood helps identify the cultural realities of Yakuin, and lunch with Hiroshima Advisors keeps them up to date.

Contradiction: Maintaining local momentum while concentrating on Okinawa and best way to keep dry during rainy season. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: John Lindstrom and Kenji Yoneda represent Osaka Regional Team at National Meeting held in Tokyo and return with a report on the upcoming ICA membership drive, the National Advisory Board and Japan's participation in the IERD. LENS Symposium opens with 20 around the table.

Internal: House welcomes Mrs. Sadako Yoshikawa back after month's rest with her son, and Patty Bray is sent out with a sayonara party.

Contradiction: Creatively approaching challenge of turning end of the year "in the red" into "in the black". (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Town Meeting evaluation and training is scheduled for Urakawa Women's Club leaders. Haboro Jaycees practice LENS monthly in regular meeting and will demonstrate it at a regional conference. Volunteers Matsumoto-San, Kitamura-San, and Sakamoto-San help write Oyubari five-year brochure and sojourn off and on during the past month.

Internal: Roundtable writes *Haiku* poems on the Other World category "terrifying numbness."

Contradiction: Having enough cars for treks. (Wk. 6)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Regional circuiting pays off as Team receives two LENS inquiries from Newcastle contacts. Sydney agency, Helping Hand, holds LENS follow-up providing a significant journey for their staff and volunteers.

Internal: Four return from Area Priory meeting in Adelaide filling House for eventful house and garden spiffing up and Helping Hand LENS follow-up module.

Contradiction: Melding the global movemental calendar to Australia's uniqueness and winning Area's program bottom lines. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE

External: Central West N.S.W. marketing trip for Murrin Bridge Industries opens up marketing agent possibilities. Eva Longmore's book "Old Ways — Our Ways" is published by Western Readers — the first from Murrin Bridge, encouraging elders to continue their efforts. Alan and Irene Willoughby, Uniting Church clergy couple from Lake Cargelligo, visit for dinner.

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports IERD victories in recruiting the Global Advisory Board, now 59 people representing 21 nations; Miss Anstee, one of three deputy secretaries under the UN Secretary General, and Cyrus Vance agree to be on the Board. Kuala Lumpur reports receiving \$1000 from a Melbourne advisor, and a \$6000 LENS is scheduled and held within two weeks in Jakarta. Hong Kong reports that a representative for S.E. Asia Ford Foundation visits Mactan. Bombay reports NORAD confirms decision to make grant of Rs.745,661 (US\$84,700) as Bangalore circuit gathers Rs.21,290 in hand; and Dutch proposal for Rs.3,652,100 is written and submitted in five days at request of Dutch Government. Regional Teams set up framing visits for Lady Peggy, who begins her two-week IERD visit in North America. The key contradiction lies in the arena of doing battle with national mindsets of fear relative to the economic future.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that preparation for July '82 includes a series of collegiums on research, constructs and procedures in Kuala Lumpur, a list of new Journal quotes in Hong Kong and an HDZ Practicum in Vaviharsh. Key training programs complete the year as the 35th Global Academy graduates 42, the Taipei HDTP gears up for Week 11, and the Calcutta Methods Academy is prepared for school teachers. Discerning the edge of formation programs intensifies participation in training and July program recruitment. The key contradiction lies in the arena of completing the practical research and documentation that will inform strategies for next year by July.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Operations is on the road again in Melbourne for urban probes and LENS. Two India schools are in being simultaneously and are going well. Budhoda and Nanded trek completes Practicums in all Maharashtra projects enabling HDZ documentation. Interchange is intensified to enable all Houses to participate in planning Continental Colloquy in India. A LENS with MICO (Bosch) in Nasik is secured. CHINEX finishes yearly evaluation of North America and Latin America and Operations' role, thereby revealing the great programmatic thrust. The major breakthrough in India is in assigning Kevin Boivin to task force to organize massive *Shramdam* (workday) in Chikhale to enable many keystones to be put in place at once. The key contradiction lies in the arena of ensuring significant engagement of the troops at home when the major battles across the continents have captured everyone's imagination.

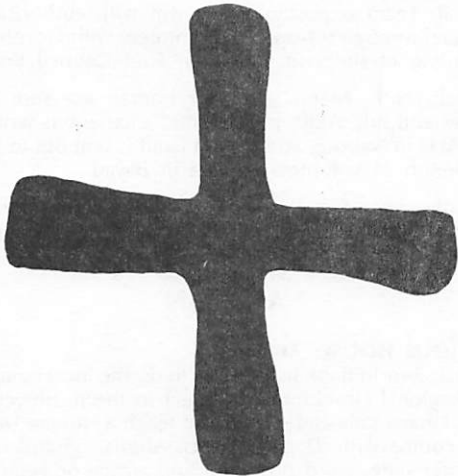
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: First ever four-sector and Karnataka-based HDTI ends with commitment from five villagers to launch cluster experiment of caring for the villages around Gunjurpalya in the Bangalore Region. Mr. Narasa Reddy, recently appointed Head of Rural Development for Canara Bank across India, writes glowing report on ICA's Human Development Training Seminar for bank officials. Brahmin social worker from Madras, a recent HDTI grad, offers the ICA three rooms in his family's downtown Madras house as ICA office anytime team is in town.

External: Nexus signal gives a chance to plan programme schedule for Quarter IV and assignments model for Quarter I. First Australian patron's gift for \$3,000 is received for IERD funding maneuver.

Internal: Nexus planning and scheduling ends with great celebration on the roof with real steak and beer after Nexus participates in volleyball game in House compound.

Contradiction: Getting the implementation details behind the big resolve. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Breakthrough on new government agreement comes as Agriculture Ministry gets Prime Minister's O.K. for ICA to do a project in Trengganu. A series of very key calls is made relative to future program possibilities — United Engineers (LENS); FELCRA (LENS and Human Development Course); and Prof. Ungku Aziz, University of Malaya (IERD sponsorship). Unexpected gift of HK\$1,000 comes from a newly married couple who wanted to share their wedding gifts with some worth-while enterprise.

Internal: House guests include Robertson Wong, local colleague, and friend with slides from Mainland China and London volunteer Caroline Studholme.

Contradiction: Ensuring victory for the year while forging ahead on key advantages toward next year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Another week of programme calls doubles number of programmes working to ten. Former staff residence on second floor of community centre is turned into ICA office separate from community office.

Internal: House completes journey through profound despair to profound decision as last two boxes of Quarter III Roundtable Journey Chart are filled in.

Contradiction: Finding new avenues for community programmes to replace those disturbed by school examinations and district elections. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Utilizing the framing visit for IERD authorization at a time when the nation is fractured into numerous splinter groups over the national elections and the conflict in the Malvinas. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: The grand advance in the project agricultural service program takes place this week with three long-awaited events. First, the governor, mayor, BID representative, members of two government cooperative institutions, national press, and project guardians attend celebration of the cooperative's legal constitution with 23 members having been associated and having paid their investment deposit. Second, cooperative agricultural offices are established and furnished to receive their first visit of a vegetable-freezing firm representative who expresses interest in contracting all of the cooperative's future production. Third, emergency phone call arrives with news from Washington of the approval of construction contracts which will provide for irrigation services to some 115 cooperatives members.

Internal: House celebrates Juana Neriquita's birthday with two roasted pigs and 100 guests, making a total of 200 guests who are served meals in one week between Juana's birthday and celebration of the constitution of the cooperative.

Contradiction: Pulling all ends together to begin construction on other side of approval of irrigation contracts. (Wk. 6)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Development team brings in J\$750 cash, one ton of fertilizer, 250 bags of cement, brushes, paint, letterhead, envelopes, name cards, eight hotel rooms for three nights, lumber and two pigs; and development team submits two proposals, markets LENS with date set for Girl Guides of Jamaica and writes Cluster budgets. Team and ICA Board set up visit of Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay with Governor General appointment confirmed, press releases out, and ICA Board dinner party set. Cluster actuation moves ahead with Cluster Leaders Meeting (48), sign painting, Mt. Vernon guild meeting and preparation for Woburn. Lawn fourth-year celebration. Regional Team meeting invitations are mailed to 45.

Internal: House enjoys a profound Roundtable as well as holds a full day of global contexting for seven new staff.

Contradiction: Coordinating preparation of many events in relation to strategic intent in midst of bubbling possibilities and necessity of stretching existing generals to win every battle. (Wk. 7)

External: Agriculture technical experts begin nine-week training program in Cano Negro to launch Cluster Agriculture Program with 25 in attendance. Those who graduate from the course will be eligible for a government funding program and continuing technical assistance to ensure agriculture success. Meetings in Cano Negro, Marcelo, Urape, Mendoza and Pacheco villages this week move the Cluster down the road and release these communities to plan their own tactical implementation. PSUs held in Cano Negro and in Caracas illuminate the mission in Venezuela for 1982-83.

Internal: House sends out Neil and Steven Vance to Chicago for the summer, and receives three interns — Ed Featherstone, Eliseo Rivera and Ana Caraballo — and two sojourners from the Cluster villages. House celebrates Faith Vance's 38th birthday, John Lawton's 59th and Marita de Soto's 76th.

Contradiction: Doing implementation in the villages while orchestrating the striking visual signs that carry House through the next two quarters and manage to stay ahead of the actuation. (Wk. 8)*

External: Human Development Training School is off to a rousing start with over 80 at the opening feast, representing eight nations with staff from seven, including two raised up in Sol de Septiembre. Inkinding victories enabled by the Regional Team make opening possible. House rejoices in the arrival of a participant from Asuncion, Paraguay.

Internal: House imitates appearance of a three-ringed circus with arrival of teaching staff from Peru school, receiving and sending out of inkind goods, and interview (in House) with government representative for approval of anticipated LENS.

Contradiction: Emphasizing the fascination pole in the midst of climbing the mountain of care. (Wk. 7)

Global Development Centrum reports IERD victories in recruiting the Global Advisory Board, now 59 people representing 21 nations; Miss Anstee, one of three deputy secretaries under the UN Secretary General, and Cyrus Vance agree to be on the Board. Kuala Lumpur reports receiving \$1000 from a Melbourne advisor, and a \$6000 LENS is scheduled and held within two weeks in Jakarta. Hong Kong reports that a representative for S.E. Asia Ford Foundation visits Mactan. Bombay reports NORAD confirms decision to make grant of Rs.745,661 (US\$84,700) as Bangalore circuit gathers Rs.21,290 in hand; and Dutch proposal for Rs.3,652,100 is written and submitted in five days at request of Dutch Government. Regional Teams set up framing visits for Lady Peggy, who begins her two-week IERD visit in North America. The key contradiction lies in the arena of doing battle with national mindsets of fear relative to the economic future.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that preparation for July '82 includes a series of collegiums on research, constructs and procedures in Kuala Lumpur, a list of new Journal quotes in Hong Kong and an HDZ Practicum in Vaviharsh. Key training programs complete the year as the 35th Global Academy graduates 42, the Taipei HDTP gears up for Week 11, and the Calcutta Methods Academy is prepared for school teachers. Discerning the edge of formation programs intensifies participation in training and July program recruitment. The key contradiction lies in the arena of completing the practical research and documentation that will inform strategies for next year by July.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Bombay completes Practicums in all Maharashtra projects enabling HDZ documentation. Chicago begins Continuum work on briefs documentation. Phase I finalizes writing of 6th Grade Trip curriculum and the 27-page camp staff manual, and camp T—shirts arrive. Breakthroughs are seen in LENS presentation producing paid pre-LENS forum in Kuala Lumpur and with Chicago orienting 6th Grade Trip staff. The key contradiction lies in the arena of going full speed ahead without clear July '82 assignments. *

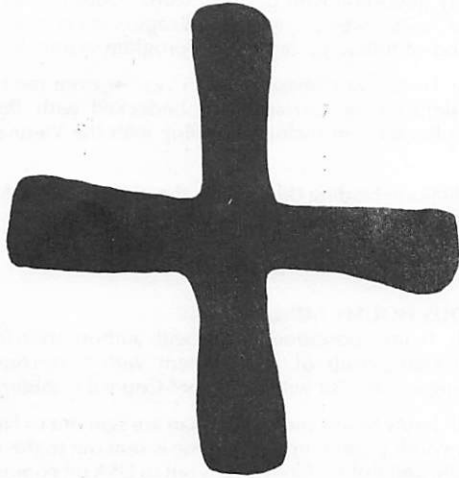
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Community Action Magazine grants right of reply to an unhelpful article.

Internal: A fridge is acquired within budget and new vegetable garden begins to announce its promise.

Contradiction: Being required to make quick decisions when values are unclear and time is encroached upon by unanticipated needs arising from being in a new place. (Wk. 10)*

Internal: Don McClain barbecues steak in back yard at 5 a.m., prepares fried eggs, oven-fried potatoes, cinnamon rolls and orange juice so that House may consume scrumptious Breakfast.

Contradiction: Creating plan for regularizing contacts with Regional Team and bringing to pass program possibilities. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Computer Paradigm delivers first computer sale, collects balance of payment, and begins negotiation with Stu Umpleby for additional management services contract with American Society for Cybernetics. Team sets up Roundtable event in Baltimore Metro.

Internal: Mann family hosts Team and Indian colleagues, Bob and Rohini Godbole, for backyard picnic; and Baltimore colleagues host meal and Indian recital.

Contradiction: Creating models and implementing steps to see House through to September 1st. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Appointment with Private Industry Council to make a Training, Inc. presentation makes it clear that setting up a new program now, when everyone else is despairing over budget cuts, ministers to human suffering and creates a tactical advantage.

Internal: House youth take college entrance exams and then unwind with movie, swimming and birthday dinner for Pat Goad.

Contradiction: Taking creative work being done by Regional Team dispersed across six states and articulating underlying coherence of local effectiveness and comprehensive responsibility for the planet's future. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Jim spends one and a half days in Chicago talking with area prior and centrum representatives about strategy to deal with the economic in general and the woodworks in particular. Heritage group meets and works out plan to print fifth chapter of the History of Starks. Invitations to anniversary dinner (Starks HDP — 4th, Starks Enterprises Corporation — 3rd) are mailed out across Starks and Region. Portland cadre meeting studies Hinduism as a part of its world religions series. Tim continues fund-raising efforts for MicMac recognition.

Contradiction: Creating strategy which covers crises before they happen. (Wk. 10)*

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Established colleague, Ruth Low, opens English establishment doors in women's network for impending visit from Lady Peggy Lindsay. Claude Lalonde extends invitation to work with local core in Rivieres des Prairies for community festival and other projects.

Internal: House beautification continues in the wake of Tokyo Sojourn brochure in the form of a newly painted fire escape and city-donated flowers.

Contradiction: Building one world in Quebec by overcoming two solitudes with common strategy and approach. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Team experiences incredible advantage of IERD in the Region as Lady Peggy Lindsay, in a night and a day whirlwind, artfully impacts women leaders in all sectors. Four events, four key appointments and 63 people leave "locals" exhausted as Lady Peggy flies on with zest to Ottawa and Montreal. David Patterson, expert in financial futures, speaks to invited guests on "Third World Development as Key to the Economic Crisis in the First World". The response is "yes" by President of State Bank of India — "Now what do the delivery mechanisms need to look like."

Internal: Contract is submitted to Anglican hierarchy toward parish service to multi-cultural neighbourhood surrounding House in return for a lower or zero rent.

Contradiction: Finessing crucial office and marketing systems for carrying momentum into the fall. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Lady Peggy Lindsay makes contact with key women and old friends in Ottawa in public and voluntary sectors who respond with offers to help. Regional Team reviews last year and plans for autumn (Quarter II).

Internal: Deloughery family returns from Australia.

Contradiction: Overcoming "break-even" image of Conference allowing great city-wide event. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: During follow-up visits after the Atlantic Potential Academy, Demonstration LENS participants request programme for the fall (Quarter II). Documentation of the Academy is completed and delivered to participants.

Internal: Four evening sessions on the adventures of Marco Polo ground the venturing dynamic and provide positive images of being over-against the complete unknown.

Contradiction: Determining the key moves that will put into place the strategy for 1982-83. (Wk. 7)

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY**

External: Sir James Lindsay and Richard Kitney visit Mexico City for 10 appointments and two receptions with the public and private sectors in two days. The UNDP and CEPAL Representatives offer to open many doors within the Mexican State Government and throughout Central America. The coordinating group in San Camico meet for first time following final workshop of the Community LENS; first workday in San Camico catalyzes over 100 persons in a clean-up of one of the community parks. Internal: Raphael Davila visits Mexico City for several days and has an in-depth discussion with colleague Fr. Benjamin Bravo on the Church in Mexico and the ICA's role throughout Latin America.

Contradiction: Rapidly constructing the leadership base in San Camico while establishing an office and participating in the larger mission across the Region. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: House celebrates penetration of Area Mexico with deepening relationships through LENS courses in Panama and Costa Rica and employing two new LENS teachers local to this area. This week final touches are made, and grand opening of the community kitchen takes place, serving 100 children and adults daily. Three preschool children are "adopted" with foreign subsidy for their schooling costs.

Internal: Jim Kelly is welcomed and put to work in three different programs.

Contradiction: Keeping the sign of village agricultural programs moving at maximum pace until major pending changes of organization are made. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Sir James and Lady Peggy Lindsay visit Jamaica for IERD, visiting the Governor-General, British and Indian High Commissioners, Minister of Youth and Community Development, Chairman of Jamaica Development Bank, Chairman of Grace Kennedy and Company, President of the Private Sector Organization of Jamaica, UNDP Representative for the Caribbean, and Metal Box and speaking to Kingston Rotary Club, Council of Voluntary Social Services, ICA Board of Directors dinner party and party at home of Deputy British High Commissioner. The Lindsay's visit is covered by radio, T.V. and newspaper. Sir James also visits Woburn Lawn and the Blue Mountains Cluster. ICA gains new image of "international rural development" experts.

Internal: House holds its Annual Staff Evaluation and Planning Retreat, inking seven rooms and a conference room for three nights at Jamaica Pegasus Hotel in Kingston.

Contradiction: Facing tight, overlapping, demanding schedules with inadequate preparation and minimal supporting systems. (Wk. 9)*

LIMA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA****CARACAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Agriculture technical experts begin nine-week training program in Cano Negro to launch Cluster Agriculture Program with 25 in attendance. Those who graduate from the course will be eligible for a government funding program and continuing technical assistance to ensure agriculture success. Meetings in Cano Negro, Marcelo, Urape, Mendoza and Pacheco villages this week move the Cluster down the road and release these communities to plan their own tactical implementation. PSUs held in Cano Negro and in Caracas illuminate the mission in Venezuela for 1982-83.

Internal: House sends out Neil and Steven Vance to Chicago for the summer, and receives three interns — Ed Featherstone, Eliseo Rivera and Ana Caraballo — and two sojourners from the Cluster villages. House celebrates Faith Vance's 38th birthday, John Lawton's 59th and Marita de Soto's 76th.

Contradiction: Doing implementation in the villages while orchestrating the striking visual signs that carry House through the next two quarters and manage to stay ahead of the actuation. (Wk. 8)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Human Development Training School is off to a rousing start with over 80 at the opening feast, representing eight nations with staff from seven, including two raised up in Sol de Septiembre. Inking victories enabled by the Regional Team make opening possible. House rejoices in the arrival of a participant from Asuncion, Paraguay.

Internal: House imitates appearance of a three-ringed circus with arrival of teaching staff from Peru school, receiving and sending out of inkind goods, and interview (in House) with government representative for approval of anticipated LENS.

Contradiction: Emphasizing the fascination pole in the midst of climbing the mountain of care. (Wk. 7)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: The Bananiculture course in Bracana starts with emphasis on marketing. Excursion from Bracana/Tatus (19 in the VW van) visits the House, has an English lesson at an English school, visits the municipal high school and receives seeds to plant gardens from agricultural extension agency. Team meeting puts together timeline for the next three months for economic, health and education programmes.

Internal: House hosts the group from Bracana/Tatus with a global slide show.

Contradiction: Getting Tonosaki and Ed Vergara back from Chile after 12 weeks of visa problems. (Wk. 9)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports from Kuala Lumpur that Richardson Vicks donates 16,000 for Global Health Care in Indonesia and zone plantation companies propose set-up trips for LENS. Final contribution tally shows \$8000 from individuals in Australia during May, 1982. Four-sector participation is achieved for the Australian Global Advisory Board as Dame Elizabeth Murdoch accepts invitation to be on the IERD GAB and offers \$5000 donation for October. Development in North America reorganizes into five teams for June, July and August maneuver, using *Chariots of Fire* imagery. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating stories of urgency and the tactics which allow results in June on the working money.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports from Kuala Lumpur that the ICA-K.L. Board decides to participate in presentation of the paper on Sungai Lui to the Committee on Agriculture Modernization, and the Federal Land Conservation Authority prepares very positive report on Sungai Lui. Arrangements are made through Kuala Lumpur for six delegates to attend July Programme while efforts intensify toward funding six more. *Campaign News* provides opportunity for humour along with victory stories. Chicago focus is on preparation for July Global Research Council with early morning collegium time design. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating enough distance on immediate programme, fiscal and framing demands to stake out broad directions for the long-term future.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that more LENS seminars are scheduled in Australia. The Student House attends House Church for their send out into the summer. Report on Meals on Wheels LENS in Orlando, Florida, highlights training dynamic using a five-day time design. A key breakthrough is that the Operations Continuum team in Chicago is being trained on the typesetter to enable publication of this report. The key contradiction lies in the arena of closing the deals and phasing the manoeuvres so that a bridge is built through July.

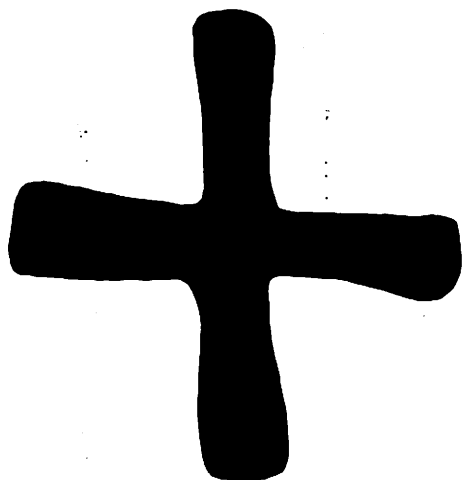
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

First aid course continues another week in Ferreiros.

Internal: Barbara gives sterling collegium series on learnings for HDZ; coming from Africa Assembly in Kenya, colleagues mob new ICA House for grand opening; and Hortencio, Jeronima and Branca publically ritualize their one-year internship with their parents present.

Contradiction: Responding to the same external demand with only half the number of people. (Wk. 11)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Area Council in New Area House draws to a close with a challenging six-month calendar and a fine amateur cricket match in the local park. Volunteer Service Programme is advertised as part of a radio-sponsored event in a London Park and LENS PSU is set with Age Concern staff. Community Action Magazine grants right of reply to an unhelpful article.

Internal: A fridge is acquired within budget and new vegetable garden begins to announce its promise.

Contradiction: Being required to make quick decisions when values are unclear and time is encroached upon by unanticipated needs arising from being in a new place. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Two House members attend Continental Council in new continental training facility in Brussels, returning home with new steps for next six months. Continuing Region's effective method of communication, June newsletter gets out in June.

Internal: Therese Norton is inducted into worldwide Scouting movement by joining local Brownie pack, and Felicia joins school gymnastic team.

Contradiction: Formulating places to stand on the other side of initial forays into computer training and Dublin Region. (Wk. 11)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Roundtable with five guests features conversation on interdependence, led off by international businessman who met ICA in his company's LENS in Zambia.

Internal: Continental Council reflects on the last year across Europe and suggests strategic directions for next two years.

Contradiction: Expressing intuitions about the future. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Jim Campbell and Richard Maguire join House for three days of brooding on Ludwigshafen, including visits with core members Theysohn, Tittes, and Teschner. Highlight is a tour of BASF Ludwigshafen — six square kilometers of petrochemical production with 50,000 workers. ICA staff and core consent that contextual re-education is key to next stage in this city-wide project.

Internal: Conversation with Frankfurt colleague Michael Schmitt about his experience in Brussels Fortnight shows that one-day neighbourhood research module was most addressing part of course.

Contradiction: Keeping feet on the ground and running in "up-in-the-air time of year". (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week of eventfulness is themed by several beats on volunteer program, beginning with fully-attended ICA Board meeting at which Board members assign Joyce (and Holland-born Mark Alan) to tell story of Dutch volunteers at July Council; and they are the first to respond to grassroots mailing to fund the trip. Paul Weijers arrives for two-week sojourn in preparation for future volunteer experience. Mr. and Mrs. Rosenboom, parents of a volunteer in Kenya, come for an evening of visiting and surprise House with slides from Jan Willem, thereby creating real sharing experience as House members help to interpret the unscripted pictures.

Internal: House and Paul arrive in Brussels early for the Computer PSU and stay after Continental Council to discuss India with people who have been there.

Contradiction: Being clear on summer particulars while overall orchestration remains hazy. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: House treks to Continental Council in Brussels and experiences Europe's victory of confidence and sense of expectation. George Medel, Indian Theology student, and Lyle Hofmann from Nebraska express interest in IERD and local engagement.

Internal: House has festive dinner to send out the St. Johns to David's graduation and Global Council.

Contradiction: Maximizing use of limited time to launch all the quarter's activities before entire Regional Team is scattered. (Wk. 10)*

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: House hosts great Regional Team celebration with 18 colleagues present. One-day consultation in "How to keep meetings focussed" is a great success. Report is submitted to Caritas Italiano on leadership development course.

Internal: House sends out Shelley Hahn and Marsha Silvia on European tour enroute to Chicago.

Contradiction: Accomplishing timelined implementaries built for ten people with only four left in the House. (Wk. 8)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: IERD trip with Lady Lindsay to Oslo, Stockholm and Copenhagen results in new authorization, particularly in Denmark. Lis Banks returns from W.H.O. working group on Primary Health Care in Zagreb, Yugoslavia, which changes legislation for community participation in urban planning, hospital services, health centres and environmental research and opens new access to networks in Yugoslavia, Hungary and Moscow. New proposal is created for local urban research funding.

Internal: House youth receives school award; welcome is extended to the Rafos family celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary, and Marianne Baasch joins in weekly evaluation and planning.

Contradiction: Creating timeline which takes advantage of momentum, deals with financial situation, creates major documentation and reports, and at the same time is present to numerous W.H.O. meetings. (Wk. 11)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: Development circuits net \$1600. Registration forms are finally deposited with proper Austrian authority to await response in "six weeks." Metro colleagues meet to assist in translation of follow-up letters and program materials.

Internal: Pentecost climaxes church year — even the horse-drawn sight-seeing carriages are bedecked with flowers. House cultural event includes evening with the Vienna Boys Choir.

Contradiction: Finding the door in the cloister that is Austria that gives *entre* to eventful programming. (Wk. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA

External: Team is positioned to win with authorisation in Beni Suef through set-up of appointment with Governor and scheduling of site visit with Beni Suef Council President.

Internal: Jenny Mann and Lori Haman are sent out to families and July youth programme; Charlene is sent out to the AALD in Nairobi, and Robert Graff is sent out to USA on completion of volunteer service in Bayad.

Contradiction: Maintaining village and staff momentum and spirit unrelated to arrival of major funding and the approach of the month of Ramadan. (Wk. 9)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: World Bank invites ICA to do the local component in a Regional Development Project in the northwest Ivory Coast. Ghana colleagues hold and teach a Human Development course with 27 participants. Abidjan guardian offers computer time, word processor and advice on registration.

Internal: House receives M. Agbétobognon Codjo Galmier Kelly as an Intern.

Contradiction: Having no plan "B" when plan "A" is very vulnerable. (Wk. 7)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Seven Nigerian ICA Trustees visit with report on the push for a delegation to the Honourable Minister of Internal Affairs appealing for an early grant of a visa quota. Sr. Bernadette, Owolala, and Alhaji Salu make final preparations to attend Africa Assembly on Local Development.

Internal: Area Lagos fasts on behalf of the globe, discovering focused corporate power in the midst of a dispersed celebrational life of individual outings, the movie *Rocky II* and a village funeral celebration.

Contradiction: Enabling the corporate imagination to go beyond Wednesday, when half the troops leave. (Wk. 8)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Entourage of 64 government officials headed by the Honourable Mbilishi, MCC., Canadian High Commissioner and IBM chief are entertained by a crowd of 1,500 villagers as the project participates in the much longed for year closing celebration.

Internal: As most of the House goes to Nairobi for Africa Assembly courtesy of airlines and travel agents, Women's Industry Group prepares feast for 200 people.

Contradiction: Learning, as the high level confidant of the President of Zambia pays tribute of self-dependence, how not to develop a complacent mindset but move on towards greater horizons. (Wk. 11)*

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: African Assembly for Local Development opens with talk from Assistant Minister of Economic Planning and Development focusing on "People and bottom-up Development". Showcase illustrates the diversity within common strategies and gives permission for fruitful dialogue. Over 20 agencies are represented at each of the above events. In addition to Kenya representation, five from Zambia, one from Egypt, two from Europe, eight from Ghana, three from the Ivory Coast, five from Nigeria and three from India reflect global and African concern for effective development means.

Internal: 1981 audit begins, and collegiums on India and Europe give all an additional global perspective.

Contradiction: Finding the time to adequately plan the next quarter before everyone leaves. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: Village Leaders Institute graduates 25 in Bokingonia Sublocation. Nyakooro Health Caretakers form first Rural Chapter of St. Johns Amubulance Society in Western Kenya.

Internal: Representatives of Section and House are sent to the African Assembly for Local Development in Nairobi and Kamweleni.

Contradiction: Maintaining village leaders' participation in DOOP meeting and programmes during rains and weeding season. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: 106 Mitaboni Location leaders attend volunteer sign-up meeting on opportunities to work in movement teams. LENS is held for Masii Location officers, a farmers' conference is held in Muputi, and impact set-up begins for the last two locations in the Central Division of Machakos — to expand the project to 203 villages and reach the outskirts of Nairobi.

Internal: House loans most of its beds for the African Assembly for Local Development.

Contradiction: Finding no structural way to coordinate the schedules of four-sector coalition groups. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Site visit leads to a promise to assist with cold storage at Chikhale cluster. 400 people participate from four sectors in *sharamdan* events at Chikhale village. Nexus prepares for and participates in 130-person Continental Colloquy in Sevagram.

Internal: While city prepares for monsoon season, Bombay Nexus sends children back to school for new year and Monu to Chicago. Collegiums highlight week as Don Francis shares learnings from Sevagram Ashram Retreat and a look at training needs for 1982-83 gives new images and directions for coming year.

Contradiction: Ensuring corporate time to think through research learnings for the year and get team spirit injected into the Global Council. (Wk. 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Twenty-four women attend meeting to arrange for the registration of "The Dalit Mahila Mandal, Maliwada". Rs.1,700 is received from Insurance Company for paying a defaulter's debt.

Internal: Great collegium on "How To Lead Collegiums" imparts some common memory not previously known.

Contradiction: Creating a context where people can see the benefit from participating in the Cluster. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Several weeks of expenditure comes to great conclusion in a four-sector *shramdan* of 400 people, including 100 from the Police training school and others from many different organizations in Bombay as well as Panvel guardians, who build first section of road to Market Centre. Cluster participation is capped by excellent meal that feeds all these people.

Internal: In the midst of preparations for the *shramdan*, the Ashram is given a new roof in preparation for the monsoon.

Contradiction: Accelerating the swirl begun by the *shramdan* rather than resting on our laurels. (Wk. 9)

HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — JAWALE

External: *Gram Sabha* team completes 28th *Gram Sabha* after visits are made to 40 Block villages with 1,459 participants in *Gram Sabhas* so far. Highlight is Bhadewade with 110 present and a great feast for the team. Village Leaders Institute is held on June 4th in Jawale with three Block villages in attendance — one did not even hold a *Gram Sabha*; 75 attend with RCF representation and Mr. Shiroher, retired soil conservation officer from Pune, is the keynote speaker. Cluster team completes commercial industry survey in 11 villages and moves on to the household survey. Mahila Mandal Institute completes invitations and meeting design.

Internal: Ashram sends out Amy Jennings to Kenya; Dennis Jennings and the Hancocks arrive back from HDTI; and Ashram has surprise visit from Reemsta family on global honeymoon tour.

Contradiction: Fighting the urge to slow down pace in anticipation of the Council and the monsoon. (Wk. 9)

David Patterson, expert in financial futures, speaks to invited guests on "Third World Development as Key to the Economic Crisis in the First World". The response is "yes" by President of State Bank of India — "Now what do the delivery mechanisms need to look like."

Internal: Contract is submitted to Anglican hierarchy toward parish service to multi-cultural neighbourhood surrounding House in return for a lower or zero rent.

Contradiction: Finessing crucial office and marketing systems for carrying momentum into the fall (Quarter II). (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Lady Peggy Lindsay makes contact with key women and old friends in Ottawa in public and voluntary sectors who respond with offers to help. Regional Team reviews last year and plans for autumn (Quarter II).

Internal: Deloughery family returns from Australia.

Contradiction: Overcoming "break-even" image of Conference allowing great city-wide event. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Northumberland Coop comes through with training/documentation contract while waiting for development proposal to be approved. Whirlwind visit to Lorne de l'Acadie opens eyes to the wonder of a community on the move. Rader called for summer development.

Internal: Owner of house cuts the rent in less than half in order to allow "these good tenants" to stay; REP House space is recreated to allow for globalized training formats to take priority.

Contradiction: Telling story which allows Regional Team to free themselves for Global Research Council in July. (Wk. 12)*

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY**

External: Meeting with a youth group in Nezahuacoyotl, a *barrio* in neighboring San Camilo, sets up a CYF for July and a series of training sessions for youth who will lead the workshops. Three preschool children are "adopted" with foreign subsidy for their schooling costs.

Internal: Jim Kelly is welcomed and put to work in three different programs.

Contradiction: Keeping sign of village agricultural programs moving at maximum pace until major pending changes of organization are made. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Nine nations are touched by development calls on the Trinidad, Mexico and China Embassies. Proposals are submitted to Australian and British High Commissions. Cluster moves forward with Beautification Contest with villages out-doing each other with flower gardens, white-washed lined rock gardens and putting up yellow, green and black welcome signs. Cluster report is given to Children National Coordinating Committee. Woburn Lawn 4th year celebration preparation includes press release, 100 invitations and inkind pickups; the celebration opens Sunday with Thanksgiving service with 180 attending from nine villages at the Anglican Church.

Internal: House welcomes the Pacheco family from Cano Negro to Woburn Lawn HDP for three weeks of English training before going on to Chicago for July '82 programme.

Contradiction: Re-manoeuvring Woburn Lawn's orbit after four years in flight to include new convoy formation of the Cluster. (Wk. 10)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Azpitia's sewing class is booming with 19 students and use of new plywood tables. The honey industry continues to prosper, selling over 100 jars of honey. Development wheels are turning again with six appointments and three women forming a task force for a money-raising function.

Internal: Working and celebrating House life this week includes planting garden and watching the vegetables grow and celebrating 32nd year in the life of Hermias Francisco Yaya Huapaya.

Contradiction: Finding the image of ourselves as "second string" has obscured the fact that we are also the only string. (Wk. 10)*

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Long awaited MARAVEN cheque for 10,000 Bolivares is finally presented with nine company officials present and a photographer recording the event for publication; bringing total for the week to 11,000 Bolivares. Three Assemblies are conducted in Nucleo Cluster Villages with excellent participation. The agriculture *tecnico*, assigned by the Ministry of Agriculture to work full time with the Cluster, visits all 13 villages in one week to determine how he can be of the greatest assistance to the farmers of Barlovento. The *Damas Diplomaticas*, the Organization of Ambassadors Wives, visits Cano Negro and suggests that Team submit a proposal to them for Cluster funding in September.

Internal: Cano Negro and ICA colleagues celebrate 33rd birthday of Eliseo Rivera with a feast, guitar music and singing. House sends out Neil Vance and the Boivins to July Council.

Contradiction: Securing authorization support to break loose major keystones for every village in the Cluster, while continuing with intensive leadership training. (Wk. 10)*

External: Four sectors celebrate in grand style the closing of the HDTS and the 4th year anniversary of Sol de Septiembre HDP. Exequiel and Clarita Rivas distribute certificates to 30 full-time participants. Event is hosted by Joaquina Rodriguez and Raul Jorquera who are from Sol and were on faculty of HDTS; and celebrative banquet is inkinded entirely from Sol residents plus donation of Pepsi-cola. Commissioned extension team includes five communities of *Comuna* (county) plus Paraguay. Guest speakers include assistant to mayor of county.

Internal: House participates (through wonder of satellite television) the awe-filled opening of *Futbol Mundial* in Barcelona, Spain.

Contradiction: Moving through "no cash" situation to planning for the next great leap on the other side of HDTS. (Wk. 10)*

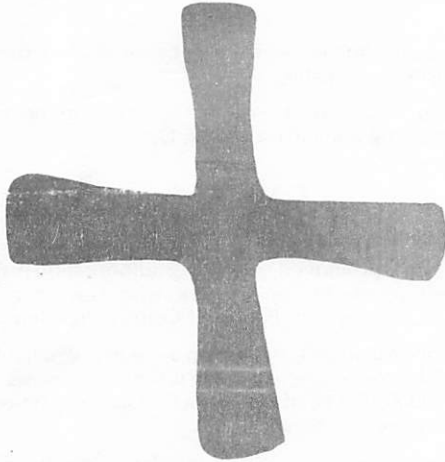
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports from Kuala Lumpur that Lee Foundations donates \$6,400.00. Bombay has received Rs. 30,000 from Batliboi and in Brussels, NORAD invites a \$79,000 proposal for Portugal. The key contradiction is creating the practical picture of how development is different next year.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that SEAPAC Soundings has been mailed to Houses in the SEAPAC Nexus Band, the Maharastra Human Development zone synopsis is produced and the Continental Coloquy in Sevagram is held with 145 present. The key contradiction is sustaining momentum with demands of Global council.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that a LENS is held in Jakarta with Kalka Farms, a pharmaceutical company, an RS-1 in Frankfort and the report from the Sevagram colloquy in Sub Asia is produced.
