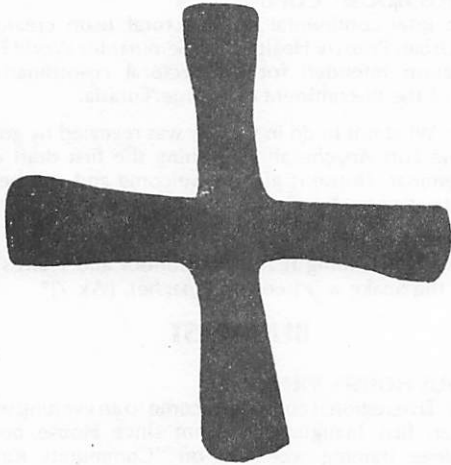

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Trek to Segovia province nets eight Community Forums for second fortnight of February. Week II circuit to Soria province solidifies forum follow-up there with Youth Forum set up, and community survey is analyzed which also reveals concern for youth. In Lamego, 95 diplomas are handed out to graduates and faculty of HDTI and Portuguese Minister of Education addresses closing feast.

Internal: House considers installing revolving door as Bill, Russell and Lucas are sent out to Lamego for school closing and strategy week, and Development arrives for a solid week of appointments before also heading off to Portugal.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues into leadership posts in order to make best use of the advantages we have. (Wk. 5)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Journey towards Community Forum authorization on "home turf" begins with visit to mayor of the borough. Guardian John Garnett agrees to include an article in the *Journal of the Industrial Society of Great Britain*. Volunteer Orientation Weekend is attended by six potential volunteers, all of whom indicate intent to begin their Third World experience.

Internal: House is strengthened and enlivened by the presence of three sojourners in training for their volunteer service in Kenya and Australia, and two permeators begin new jobs.

Contradiction: Working harder during Day One does not seem to be adequate plan for increasing effectivity as escalation of opportunity goes on creating more indicative. (Wk. 3)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: The newsletter "*Region Reports*" is print ready after corporate writing. Volunteer Service Programme materials are sent out to 14 additional colleges and universities with one phoning the House the following day to set appointment for a visit. An unexpected donation arrives from a participant in recent Volunteer Orientation Weekend.

*Come, let us return to the LORD;

Internal: House experiences once again the enjoyment of its corporateness in a work-morning in neighbour's front garden.

Contradiction: Remaining comprehensive during this coming week of celebrations. (Wk. 7)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: ICA participates in "Our World and You" Exhibition alongside 15 other agencies. Global Film is shown to 1000 participants. Imaginal activities engage 700 students in experiencing other cultures and the Third World. Regional Team of ten is involved in set up, manning the booth, evaluation of the exposition method and celebration.

Internal: House is filled as Continent, Area and Region join in adventure of the Exhibition Week. Monsuir Shah and Joan Weeks create Pakistani feast highlighting Arabic writing and multi-cultural fancy dress.

Contradiction: Getting our feet in all the newly opened doors without losing focus or momentum. (Wk. 8)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Nine prospective volunteers engage in Volunteer Orientation Weekend and experience a mosaic of situations where human development needs them. Staff is impressed with construct strength which presents human development as an appropriate response to the events of this century. Participants stage great celebration, and Eneida Andrade arrives from Portugal en route to Brazil to share news of Lamego.

Internal: Ken Gilbert comes for four days to share the construct and style of the Volunteer Orientation Weekend as developed in Area London, greatly strengthening Paris Team readiness for first such programme. Jon Considine brings Jamaica and Frankfurt to the table.

Contradiction: Using the Panchayat visit to push the story and strategy of Area Paris Religious Houses. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Thirteen out of sixteen Nexus troops are on the road doing Development, Lamego Regional Practicum Lab, integrated circuits and regional colloquys.

Internal: Timely, spontaneous *whoop-de-doo*s (otherwise known as discontinuous events) demonstrate that motivity does not depend on numbers. Such events include hair cutting party, cross-word puzzle marathon, dramatic supper buffets and whirl-wind tour of Brussels for Fr. Marcel Rainville.

Contradiction: Building creative time designs that allow few troops to do all nexus functions while keeping internal fires burning. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Third session of *Third Wave* study group is led in French by one of the participants and another volunteer for the next session. Participation in a "Public Enquiry in Social Injustice" leads to invitation for further involvement. One of the Teachers Association that meets in the House comes to lunch and pledges every Thursday afternoon to "anything that needs to be done."

Internal: Hosting the founders of *CERAN*, a unique and most prestigious language institute in Belgium, reveals their deep understanding of the importance of community living, and promises well for a deep collegial (and lucrative commercial) relationship in the future. House celebrates the completion of four papers that cover arenas of rationality (strategy), sociality (five foundations), sexuality (role of Women's Revolution) and phasiality (journey of second phase) in time for Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Clarifying and using new imaginal and accessible poetry that holds together the archaic, futuric, comprehensive intentions of all that is breaking loose. (Wk. 7)\*

**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Ludwigshafen — HDZ target — momentum continues to build as 25 people come to meeting concerning the *auslander* (foreigners/guestworkers) issues. Four new people join core committed to training and spearheading comprehensive care.

Internal: Jon Considine goes to Paris for Week II to staff VOW (Volunteer Orientation Weekend), and returns with new insights on the role of working with volunteers.

Contradiction: Empowering real colloquy priorities by forcing creativity with troop limits. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: *Mardi Gras* celebration spins into fortnight recruitment, polishing the cover letter, outlining article for Newsletter and colleague writing notes of invitation to new contacts.

Internal: House studies contain strong beat on the globe with Wednesday collegium on "*The World Challenge*" and Roundtable study. The Long March impacts both House and guests. Key spirit event of week is Saturday afternoon celebration of new House team which is sparked by presence of Jan Joosten and two daughters building model city on collegium table.

Contradiction: Doing events with no unified regional story that holds Movemental consensus on practical vision. (Wk. 8)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Imaginal Education in German with 24 participants launches the Regional Colloquy. German professor visits ICA office and project in New Delhi; he is especially impressed by life style. He reports, "It's marvellous. They look smart, but very modest." House and four others visit Panchayat in Frankfurt.

Internal: Jim Campbell's workshop on Seven Revolutions gives House fresh perspective on edge in Region.

Contradiction: Going from victory to victory without creating a lasting, coordinated impact. (Wk. 5)

**ROME****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME****STOCKHOLM****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Inter-continental cross-sectoral team creates the District Urban Primary Health Care Seminar for World Health Organization intended for intersectoral co-ordination of services of the bi-continent of Europe/Eurasia.

Internal: What not to do in the city was revealed by going to the movie *Fort Apache* after finishing the first draft of the above seminar. House is glad to welcome and will be even happier to send out Jim Campbell, Robert True and Shirley St. John.

Contradiction: Finding that if the Condor and Walrus don't get you, the Snake will (see *Fort Apache*). (Wk. 7)\*

**BUDAPEST****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Five regional colleagues come to an evening with the Panchayat, first inaugurating event since House opened. Neuwaldegg training weekend on "Community Renewal Through Social Methods" with 21 participants (excluding staff) is key event with great possibilities for the future.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat team, Carol Pierce, V. Dharmalingam and Fr. Marcel from Caracas. Colleagues Manfred Golda and Karen Beckman from Area Frankfurt arrive to teach Neuwaldegg course (in German) along with Richard MacGuire from Brussels Nexus. Jim Campbell and Jim Meyers arrive from Nexus to form integrated circuit trek.

Contradiction: Devising the strategy that takes advantage of new colleagues from training weekend. (Wk. 6)

**CAIRO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Two days of lengthy visits with new local unit chief reveals willingness to help with Government routine on any project undertaken. Land is finally turned over (after two years) from property department to local council for desert reclamation expansion and new training center. Marmalade factory begins production in newly renovated facility, with new uniforms, jars, labels and tentatively secured market.

Internal: Robert Graff, Dartmouth University volunteer, arrives to begin six-month sojourn.

Contradiction: Establishing a sense of movement on all fronts across Cluster when promised financing has not arrived. (Wk. 3)

**ABIDJAN****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Visits with Phillips Petroleum, African Development Bank and Seboko Hotel move House another step toward scheduling LENS.

Internal: House celebrates two birthdays and builds detailed plans through May.

Contradiction: Lining up key components to missional plan without slowly down. (Wk. 7)\*

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Staff completes two-week Human Development Training program that has participants from Anambwa State. Governor of Lagos State visits Ijede. Hi-jacked water tower arrives in Ijede and is erected.

Internal: Rebecca Nichols and A. M. Novel arrive just in time for HDTP which hosts four Swedish volunteers for a weekend and Joe Dickson who arrives early to join Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Getting new direction clarified and new staff oriented after HDTP. (Wk. 4)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Preschool training event creates three-month circuit plan to launch preschools to serve all 12 Diamond villages. Team receives K 4,000 gift from Standard Bank and develops inkind ticket to Nairobi for staff interchange. Kapini elects new Board of Directors and appoints management team for registration and programme strengthening.

Internal: House structures are transformed as Roundtable successfully experiments with films of east and west cultures. The day's planning happens the night before with the generals planning their action plan. House hosts Board of Directors for lunch and replants vegetable garden.

Contradiction: Implementing training designs to enable local leadership to see through new directions of Human Development by ensuring direct participation from four sectors. (Wk. 3)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Alberta A.I.D. executive visits House to talk about Jamaica and Kenya funding possibilities revealing new global replication netting. Two consults in one week in Kakamega completes second location cluster project (south Tiriki location — 36 villages). Overwhelming response is happening in Iveti location circuits; the first location of 43 villages is initiated totally by impact programmes rather than full compliment HDP consults.

Internal: House spends two sessions on vision and practical manifestations for Kenya, and massive paint and decor blitz prepares House for Panchayat visit. Ackim Chimisanya arrives from Zambia, and Christopher Foya returns from Lamego, Portugal, HDTI.

Contradiction: Structuring careful preparation and adequate staff for crucial events and programme. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

External: Community committee meets with representatives of CCF for grounding in fund application when it arrives. Community leaders consent that riding promises of new school opportunities can be key to catalyzing stake consciousness and participation, and make plans again to bring stake dynamic alive. Participants of Habitat's follow-up workshop on housing spend morning in Kabiro seeking clues to motivation of squatter residents toward housing and environment up-grading.

Internal: Kabiro auxiliary explores ICA common memory with Charles Lingo in Tuesday morning collegium and joins Virginia that evening in jolly birthday celebration.

Contradiction: Synchronizing priorities in timelines of donor agencies with timed community priorities in midst of rapid acceleration in participation and number of programs. (Wk. 3)

External: First 20 Iveti Location Cluster villages (out of 43) are circuited this week using the three-day circuit model. Two-thirds of quarter's victories are reported in progress! Coordination team joins HDTI to teach GWF, which is a great event.

Internal: One Canadian and two German volunteers show up on door step and join team in circuits to Iveti. House sends out Rod Hall with grand celebration to Section B to assist in cluster and project actuation. House and HDTI attend funeral of Mienge Mutiso, a Kamweleni stake leader.

Contradiction: Formalizing a common movemental story to sustain all the villages. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Cluster vibrates with activity as Adult Literacy classes begin in Chikhale and extend to six other villages. Three borewell hand pumps are installed in Chikhale and drilling moves to Moho and Wardoli Villages. Preschool structures provide the means for improving health of cluster children, with Chikhale Preschool children receiving first health checkup at Ajivali clinic. Week culminates with incredible four-sector Human Development Association meeting which targets four actuation arenas — irrigation, co-operative dairy, cluster development association and Ambar Charkha.

Internal: First Roundtable using Quarter III construct is a fine event, with China study the highlight. Ashram welcomes new colleagues — Jenny Robins and Arun Deshmukh.

Contradiction: Keeping cluster circuit model moving with power when harvest season demands attention of villagers. (Wk. 3)

## DELHI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Twelve USA patrons visit Sikror and are greatly impacted by changes. Reception is held for them in Taj Hotel with 15 Delhi guardians. Fourth Gram Sabha held in zone cluster. AIFI agrees to co-sponsor IERD. Development trek joins House to submit Rs. 50,000 of Zowf proposal. Representatives from Women's Action for Development visit and request programme assistance.

Internal: Liza Kiran Berresford, weight three kilos, arrives in the world, following birth of Kalpana Bhojar, weight three kilos. Aboni celebrates 23rd birthday and volunteer Jennifer Schwerin arrives unannounced.

Contradiction: Utilizing all possibilities for course marketing and cluster work. (Wk. 7)\*

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Bangalore Outpost gives a stunning report of living and working in Karnataka village of Gunjurpalya. Blind man leads 20 villagers into nearby fields for nocturnal stone gathering for road-making *shramadan*. Local Canara Bank official, acts as translator at initial village meetings. Canara Bank Head Office lines up volunteers to work with ICA staff and sends first month consultancy cheque to Bombay.

Internal: Repair of the electrical circuits returns Hyderabad Ashram to the Twentieth Century after ten days in the Dark Ages.

Contradiction: Focussing Area-wide strategic events so that a bi-product of each event is people for Bangalore HDTI. (Wk. 6)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Visits to Kolupara and Garden Reach Bustees define women's engagement strategy and initiate Imaginal Education seminar with bustee school teachers. Development obtains firm commitments on new strategy of IERD brochure from Guest Keen Williams (GKW). Metal Box decides to participate in bustee development with a contract for uniforms. Teachers Centre Imaginal Education results in a circular sent to 80 schools informing them of course availability.

Internal: House is fully occupied by Development and Regional Team members, bringing Roundtable alive. Ashram is transformed with new chairs and collegium table covering. Ashram goes to circus with E.G.

Contradiction: Manning the keys of quarter plan while ensuring long-term future. (Wk. 5)

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Visit to the ESSO Refinery in Port Dickson produces two seminars for their top management.

Internal: Liza Tod is sent out to do development in Australia. The arrival of Raymond Spencer and Geof Nixon is celebrated with Malaysian food.

Contradiction: Making assignments in cooperation with Kuala Lumpur House to allow Nexus to prepare for upcoming programmes while maintaining frame loans and development. (Wk. 6)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Guest night Roundtable draws three new people for study of the *Malay Dilemma*. A call on the Secretary-general of the Department of Agriculture yields exciting possibility of intensive rural project work in the State of Malacca as a joint venture with that department.

Internal: House efforts to learn *Bahasa Malaysia* (Malaysian language) get a boost with corporate celebration evening playing Scrabble in *Bahasa*.

Contradiction: Getting up courage to explode each grain of possibility (development, framing, self-support) into a maneuver. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: The wife of the Regent (*Bupati*) opens the fifteenth village preschool, marking 100% coverage of sub-district villages, and decides to invite the Minister of Women to honor the preschool program. Program marketing blitz sets up two training modules, Imaginal Education course and a Business Forum with several businesses.

Internal: After five years, House receives its first refrigerator and celebrates with cold beer. House studies and conversation are highlighted by focus on China.

Contradiction: Deepening both the context and breadth of the regional frame in order that the 1982-1983 program has solid financial support. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Area prior travels to Bontoa with film crew for the Rice Harvest Festival. LENS marketing team schedules P. T. Perbebunan XXIII LENS in Surabaya Region. AMOCO donates US \$2,000, and Merpati Airlines gives 50% discount on domestic fares.

Internal: Completing police books, licence plates and auto insurance ensures structural accountability. Global Language School III is scheduled for Yogyakarta March 1-27. Robert celebrates his second birthday. Elizabeth attends special writing workshop, and Jessica makes student honor roll (all A's) for second semester in a row.

Contradiction: Prioritizing regional program to build Regional Team in the face of immediate demands for critical authorization, development and framing maneuvers. (Wk. 6)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: *Bappeda* (provincial agency for program coordination) schedules LENS. Health clinic continues follow up to health training by weighing 47 preschoolers in Belang-Belang and teaching nutrition to 20 mothers. Macoa Preschoolers show up in uniforms for the first time. Part of old provincial grant is received.

Internal: Ujung Pandang businessman who has been to Bontoa Consult and LENS drops by for a visit.

Contradiction: Ensuring that potential leaders come to the leadership module from the six sections. (Wk. 7)\*

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Best yet Hong Kong development circuit produces HK \$4500 cash and HK \$25,000 committed. Self-support needs and ICA team-up results in purchase of TRS-80 MODEL II. The global network is indeed being built! Development interchange trek to New Zealand returns with report of many program, development and framing calls.

Internal: A bucket of New Zealand butter fattens up Nexus while half of the Nexus continues mighty diet regime. First OE financial structures collegium reminds House of significant issues before Order.

Contradiction: Undiscovered spirit practices and programme enablement methods undermine stability in midst of exploding missional opportunity. (Wk. 7)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Second week of development nets letter of introduction from the Chairman of Hong Kong Chamber of Commerce to the Chairman of Pacific Basin Economic Council for IERD support and nets inked flights on Cathay Pacific Airlines for IERD set-up. Work continues on survey questions for house-to-house visitation in Nam Wai, as first step of master plan for village improvements.

Internal: New land development model attracts viewers all week, and excitement continues to grow throughout village in seeing new possibilities on the other side of this development. House celebrates week with a night out to see the movie "Blow Out" and have dinner at MacDonald's.

Contradiction: Building new village consensus of vision and contradiction as Team works toward new comprehensive plan of village development. (Wk. 7)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Brochures are printed and mailed to 50 companies for general executive LENS in April. Maersk Shipping Lines calls to request two in-house LENS for Quarter IV. Total deposits from development for February are US \$13,000.

Internal: Objective presence of John Montgomery unleashes fresh and helpful images for June HDTI curriculum and elicits new sources to inform Global Academy transposition from Dr. Chen I An amid geishas and ale.

Contradiction: Designing HDTI curriculum in order to maximize options for future program. (Wk. 8)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Site visit to Palawan Island with AMOCO releases \$7,000 for village development. Bernardito Rosalada arrives to participate in development. Auditing firm goes over books in record time. U.S. AID is moving closer to sanctification with the use of affirmative adjectives.

Internal: Efen returns from ITI in Tonga, and Caroline Studholme arrives from U.K. Evenings revolve around long-range brooding. House is impressed by winning entry in International Film Festival "36 Chowringhee Lane", an Indian film.

Contradiction: Responding to multiple programme expansion possibilities while maintaining momentum of corporate thrust. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Three health clinic buildings receive medicines from Regional Health Office. For first time Demonstration Farm in Sudtonggan harvests bitter melon (*Ampalaya*).

Internal: House joins "Feast of Santo Minro" in Cebu, one of year's biggest events. House sends some to new assignments.

Contradiction: Figuring how to move quickly in order to have catalytic group in the midst of having four big arenas with which to work. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO****TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Intensive eight-hour Town Meeting is held with 67 community leaders from one district of Fuji City at the foot of Mt. Fuji. Super intensive 5-hour Town Meeting is held with 39 JC leaders in Fukuroi City from 7:00 p.m. to midnight.

Internal: House joins in the national epidemic and celebrates "Flu Week". Sojourner parade continues with three in the process of leaving and two in the process of arriving.

Contradiction: Training Japanese movement rapidly enough to never say "no" or slow down for lack of competent bilingual staff. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: House and world mourn tragic death of Kim Tae Dong, Ex-Minister of Communications, IERD Global Advisory Board member, and long-time guardian. Australian Embassy asks ICA to double funds request. Troops from Cheong Won and Seoul set up Southern Province follow-up Assemblies.

Internal: Dr. Kim Tae Dong's funeral introduces the proper amount of mystery into our midst.

Contradiction: Preparing for Week 8 development in the midst of the hurricane that is Week 7. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON**

External: First in series of Women's Forums begins in the Cluster villages with enthusiastic comments: "We're still sleepy, but we're waking up." "We have never thought about what we can do about the future." Another Cluster Training day features two professors and the Dean of Agriculture of Cheong Buk University for half-day cattle-care training. Australian Embassy supports project by offering to double request for animal scales by adding food choppers.

Internal: Miss Han Kyung Ae goes home to Kuh Du E Ri for father's 61st birthday celebration and returns in time for House celebration at an eight-course Chinese meal hosted by guardian, Dentist Kim Young Jae.

Contradiction: Getting clear on form of cluster and cluster node, between village and myeon levels, in order to meet government officials relative to Cheong Won Cluster and Yecheon officials on behalf of future clusters. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Okinawa brochure for June LENS is sent to the printer and plans are made for mass mailing. Roundtable includes key colleagues and four young women who come with regular participant. Nagasaki Town Meeting dates firm up in communities through Mr. Honda, advisor in Nagasaki.

Internal: House life is enhanced with new kitchen hot-water heater, rice cooker and two-burner gas range purchased at a big sale held by Best Electric Company. Office is re-arranged and given new look with new carpet.

Contradiction: Working through scheduling and procedures for upcoming events. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Yen 100,000 is committed in first development appointment as Osaka Region moves into serious development efforts. Advisors prepare for monthly meeting beforehand and engage in lively discussion about theme for next LENS Symposium. Long-time colleague Reverend Doyama attends meeting and spends the night. Nagoya is visited after two year interval. Mr. Kondo, who has participated in circuits and sponsored a Town Meeting, shows continued interest and support.

Contradiction: Developing a clear strategy for funding and programmatic manoeuvres. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Two proposals are submitted to Renfrew County administration, and follow-up to ECF identifies great affirmative change in community. Co-sponsorship of IERD reception for Sir James Lindsay is arranged, and visits for Global Advisory Board receive nods of membership. Public Service Guild is launched with planning meeting.

Internal: Newsletter goes to translator. Peter Whitney enlists in the Navy, and Guatemala collegium opens up the globe again.

Clinic day in Azpitia demonstrates the effectiveness of Azpitia health caretakers, as patients are seen by David Hernandez (volunteer from California), medicines are classified, and teaching goes on simultaneously. Extension team meets to program four-valley area.

Internal: Office renovation is catalyzed by Priscilla Wilson. Rotational Mama model is initiated to insure focussed care for the children and House. Mary Wilson joins valley health team. David Thomas arrives for a month sojourn.

Contradiction: Moving with life rhythms during harvest vacation time and winning. (Wk. 5)

Business Guild of Caracas creates "CODEBA" concept, Corporation for Economic Development in Barlovento. Thirty-five attend Cano Negro Ecclesiola.

Internal: Russell Vance arrives in Cano Negro amidst intensified teamhood and victorious cockroach extermination.

Contradiction: Dancing the tension between actuation events and strategic cluster designs. (Wk. 6)

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Madison Wisconsin doctor and dentist attended by community health workers treat Sol citizens during fantastic weeklong health trek. Teachers build new curriculum while the youth corp digs a new *banio* pit (latrine). Tony Elizondo and representatives from many communities stand accountable along with the Mayor before the Governor.

Internal: New team members receive temporary residence visas (good for one year) in record two-month time.

Contradiction: Finding the road again after being given a new universe. (Wk. 8)\*

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

**External:** Ford Foundation makes the first site visit to Bracana cluster area. Two members of municipal team help host Ford representative and are key in doing site visit and discussing the proposed project. Visit results in agreement to begin work on project from both ends. Expanded municipal team agrees to basic six-month timeline for Bracana cluster project, and a sewing course is set up for Bracana.

**Internal:** Many long awaited improvements in House facilities result in several mini-celebrations. Improvements include getting a second building next door which doubles House living space, and acquiring a refrigerator, blender, and new red chairs for collegium room.

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that after bringing in \$175,000 for the month of February, the March bottom line is reset for \$210,000 in North America. Visit to Sir Frank Holmes, Chairman of New Zealand Planning Council, opens doors for New Zealand participation in IERD, particularly with Maori programmes. Proposal Drawer is created in Chicago with the assistance of the Word Processor and the rapidly growing number of trained Word Processor experts. In Kuala Lumpur a proposal workshop with the Region releases story suited to big private sector targets. The key contradiction lies in the arena of risking ourselves by banking on the Corporation Constituency for the largest percentage of the bottom line knowing that past victories have not been won through the Corporation Constituency.

The *IMAGE* on Human Motivity, the Global Academy curriculum rationale, and training designs which journey whole Chicago Nexus require Week II cross-centrum task forces. Romanus Wa'u is sent from Indonesia to accompany Integrated Research/Operations Circuit to Seoul Region to experience HDZ Cluster. Key breakthroughs include Chicago structuring configurations to put corporate mind on crucial tasks and Hong Kong sharing design of Global Academy recruitment with regions. The key contradiction lies in the arena of ineffective interchange and partial implementation of inclusive consensus relative to missional intentions.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Hong Kong works through programme plan in Hong Kong Region out of 12-year Human Development story. Chicago reports undergirding of North American program explosion with phone assessment of marketing needs, a Research-Operations Faculty Development PSU, computer faculty information update and long-range scheduling of course faculty. Chicago Nexus Training PSU builds replicable 12-week RS-I seminar method grounding model. Breakthroughs are experienced in Hong Kong as long-time friendly local church asks for the global film and new possibilities; Chicago moves to new modes of moving with high school youth, program scheduling and faculty journeys. The key contradiction lies in the arena of newly developed transrational designs revealing out-moded practical interior systems.

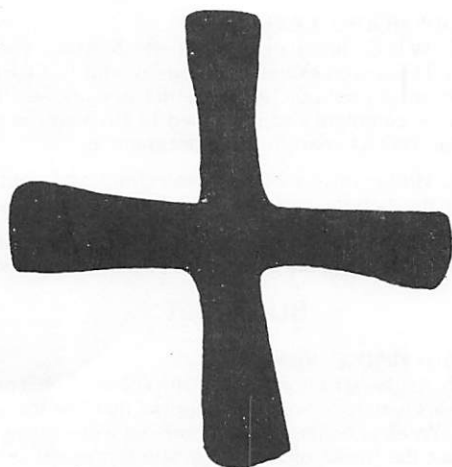
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Contradiction: Yearning to be able to select just one priority when the situation presents a variety of active programmatic targets. (Wk. 7)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Assembly line production enables regional newsletter to be sent to 80 colleagues, and team sends 19 brochures and letters for Formation Fortnight. Contradiction: Creating modes of engagement for people willing to engage. (Wk. 8)\*

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)\*

Guardian event brings together top level private sector representatives. Contradiction: Deepening both the context and breadth of the regional frame in order that the 1982-1983 program has solid financial support. (Wk. 5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Area prior travels to Bontoa with film crew for the Rice Harvest Festival. LENS marketing team schedules P. T. Perbebunan XXIII LENS in Surabaya Region. AMOCO donates US \$2,000, and Merpati Airlines gives 50% discount on domestic fares.

Internal: Completing police books, licence plates and auto insurance ensures structural accountability. Global Language School III is scheduled for Yogyakarta March 1-27. Robert celebrates his second birthday. Elizabeth attends special writing workshop, and Jessica makes student honor roll (all A's) for second semester in a row.

Contradiction: Prioritizing regional program to build Regional Team in the face of immediate demands for critical authorization, development and framing maneuvers. (Wk. 6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Fifty-five from five *desas* participate in three days of leadership training and build plans for extension of *desa* victories. Diann returns to Surabaya for LENS preparation and a day in the forest of PTP 23.

Contradiction: Using corporate structures to inform and involve all staff in midst of diverse programs and assignments. (Wk. 9)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Planning PSU with student leadership of suburban high school, with District Superintendent sitting in, is a key event that opens the door of the district to ICA. House participates in LENS facilitator training in Chicago, and first *Update* of 1982 is mailed. Wellston School District and the Day Care Department of St. Louis Housing Authority asks House to do teacher training.

Internal: Intense Week II activity leaves a vacant house as Addingtons go to Chicago and both youth go to work. *The World Challenge* study with metro colleagues continues to electrify all.

Contradiction: Responding to new contacts with new forms of practical engagement and spirit life. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Minority engagement strategy heats up as Black leaders plan next steps for local action. Indian family hosts global film event. Ghanaian student joins in metro circuit trek.

Internal: Two self-support maneuvers are launched in the form of Urban Church consultations and computer literacy classes for urban youth.

Contradiction: Finding motivating context for Regional Team meetings that clarifies issues and avoids linear thinking. (Wk. 9)\*

### **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Another successful workday toward the building of the Training Center concludes with House Church attended by all 20 grubby workers and held in the old bathroom turned office. Plans are built for food, troops and communication to ensure equal success for future workdays.

Internal: House study life is highlighted with exciting RS-I pedagogy on Friday night, re-acquainting people with Bonhoeffer and exposing all to pedagogical skills.

Contradiction: Coalescing individual concerns of Fourth Street into a Regional Team effort to see that it succeeds. (Wk. 9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Representatives of five nations and three major world religions gather for an Evening with the Institute at the residence of Anthony and Hilde Betonte in Morgantown, West Virginia. Area Guardians Trek brings to consciousness the Guardian role as Joan Seacord of New York meets Dan and Jane Moore of Huntington, West Virginia. Shrove Tuesday pancake Roundtable impacts lyricist of "We are in a New World Now" with the emerging paradigm.

Internal: Pittsburgh permeators top \$50,000 in self-support income.

Contradiction: Objectifying missional reality to allow structural care for the entire Region. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Workshop on Art Form method with entire staff of Troy Public Library includes Ken DeWeaver from Rochester on leadership team. Jan Ulangca reports many working contacts from treks to Buffalo and Ithaca. At Evening with the Institute, Jan shows slides of Panchayat trek to young professionals in Ithaca.

Internal: Area priors visit is an occasion for celebration and area interchange.

Contradiction: Re-empowering the tools that prioritize and then release time for movement building. (Wk. 9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.**

External: Regional Team launches research dimension of Regional Colloquy — *Focus: Region Washington* — by completing research screens, foraying into four polises and finishing re-gridding exercises. #### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS**

External: Hints of things to come in Starks are foreshadowed as two rocker chairs are sold and marketing booklet is prepared by the Woodworks. Starks Enterprises Corporation meets to decide specific steps for renovation. Wendy helps Maine Community Development Project continue planning of a conference, and Jim and Judy work with Augusta Agency Guild to reorganize marketing approach. Tim works with Conference on Mic Mac Recognition on Indian Island hosted by the Penobscott Nation.

Internal: House celebrates week of water coming back on (pump had been broken for over a week), four substitute teaching calls, lively China and Third World dialogue with dinner out with colleagues from Starks and Winslow.

Contradiction: Enabling decision to win in the midst of daily distractions. (Wk. 9)\*

Contradiction: Summoning the courage to take bold new steps. (Wk. 7)\*

Team has successful call with Mrs. Adela Calvani, top party leader; and Caracas Rotary Club approves proposal. RS-I is in good shape with large guardian contingent teaching.

Internal: House works on preparation for upcoming school and consult, doing songbook, flyer and village data. John Phelps donates funds to tile House floor.

Contradiction: Focusing on immediate demands amidst Carnaval vacation while facing the avalanche of Cluster set-up. (Wk. 7)\*

## **BUENOS AIRES**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO**

External: Sol really goes visible when "*QUE PASE*" (seen as Chile's most objective magazine) produces three pages of material and pictures of a care-catalyzed community. Doctors Otilia Marina and Kathy Kelly (dentist) arrive from Madison, Wisconsin, for "Health Week in Sol" which is prepared by health advocates with inkind articles from local drug companies and great support from the Mayor's office. Preschool teachers turn out en masse, and Isobel Urrutia does the second workshop session of Imaginal Education.

Internal: House plans great celebration as first retirement check (retroactive) arrives.

Contradiction: Organizing the effulgent feast into digestible bites. (Wk. 7)\*

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

**External:** Eneida Andrade returns from Portugal and France and gives reports on the Lamego HDTI and the Paris Volunteer Orientation Weekend.

**Internal:** Three days of intensive Portuguese study in the House concentrates on verbs and singing the new Roberto Carlos album. Five days of Carnaval discontinuity have the House dancing in the streets in Rio and Rio Bonito.

**Contradiction:** Putting practical content into rest of the quarter's plan for intensification of the *Bracana* area of the municipality so that the municipal team can be fully engaged. (Wk. 8)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that \$7,000 is received in Chicago from the Iowa United Methodist Hunger Task Force; visits to congressional frame and USAID are made in order to bring them up to date on ICA work; eleventh hour flurry in Area Sydney doubles monthly deposit; South Asia Trek returns to USA and IERD representatives return to their homelands bearing good news from India. Global, national and local frames are like silver tableware; regular use maintains the luster. However, many have long lain in drawers and much time is needed now to polish them vigorously. The key contradiction lies in the arena of lagging timelines of gifts which have resulted in tight, tight cash flow for first half of month in spite of substantial bottom lines.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Global Academy staff celebrate 50 registered or committed; the Health PSU involves 40 in thinking through strategic directions to implement W.H.O. slogan of "Health For All By The Year 2000". Detroit ES-I is staffed from North American Continental faculty pool looking to rapid development of first and second teachers. Brussels reports an Integrated Circuit in Rome. The power of the corporate mind becomes enabling tool for doing all the Quarter IV Roundtable dialogues and lesson plans in two days and planning the Health Systems PSU procedures in a day while keeping specialized tasks spinning. The key contradiction lies in the arena of finding practical rhythm which will focus corporate power on critical arenas and, at the same time, empower necessary task forces.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Chicago launches Nexus 13-week training design. "Glowing" LENS reports come in from around the world — Hong Kong reports LENS visits in Taiwan with three companies requesting in-house training. Kuala Lumpur reports three-session consult with two groups of managers from ESSO's Port Dickson refinery. Break-throughs include Chicago launching the North American E.G. Summer Camp plans and curriculum; and in Kuala Lumpur, LENS with executives of United Motor Works, Malaysia's leading industrial holding company, inaugurates their new training centre opened the previous week by the Prime Minister. The key contradiction lies in the arena of oozing into the week's design which limits full operating capacity.

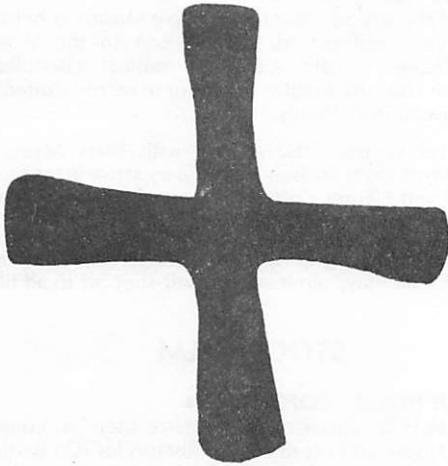
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports celebrating the completion of the Canadian ICA audit, and Bruce Williams returns with first draft of audit report. Final cleanup of the "flood" damage restores the fourth floor of the International Training Center to pre-Academy readiness. Order finance reports are completed in Chicago, Brussels and Hong Kong. Break-throughs include beginning conversations with Australian auditors revealing 100% improvement of books over last year. The trend is continuous preparations for USA ICA audit and the Global Academy — both begin in two weeks! Internal: Five-eighths of House is present during most of the week, culminating in a serious Roundtable study, conversation and Vocational Journey exercise.

Contradiction: Securing three more LENS for April. (Wk. 9)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: About 300 people participate in four Community Forums plus an Assembly in a new county, St. Joao de Pesquera, 50 km. northeast of Lamego. The five guilds meet for the second time; all decide to do local framing for ten keystone demonstrations prior to Consult on April 26.

Internal: House welcomes the third sojourner from Cluster villages.

Contradiction: Broadening geographic coverage as swirl of guild projects are accelerated for visibility by April 1. (Wk. 8)\*

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Arrival of Panchayat is utilized as reason to hold reception attended by Mayor and Deputy Mayor of the borough. Fine four-sector event sparks the imagination of many of the 35 guests present who had to choose between viewing the global film or the premiere showing of the Isle of Dogs slide show.

Internal: LENS pedagogy gets House ready for the "real thing" with demonstration LENS and voluntary sector LENS scheduled for coming week.

Contradiction: Yearning to be able to select just one priority when the situation presents a variety of active programmatic targets. (Wk. 7)

External: Development team reaches schools, companies and foundations for future funding and programme possibilities. Volunteers Orientation Week is scheduled for Week 11. Exposition evaluation report is completed.

Internal: Mary Murphy arrives to take up new assignment. St. David's Day (patron saint of Wales) is celebrated with E.G. costumes.

Contradiction: Creating time design that allows House to stand present to all aspects of the mission. (Wk. 9)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three men who work in *informatics* (word processing, computer technology) take part in Roundtable which uses reading from *The World Challenge* as reference for discussion. The dialogue continues in two English classes. Art form conversation on a piece of music is the program for fifth monthly English Evening. Desmond Avery does LENS in London with a social service employment agency.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates first printing of a new report.

Internal: Beverly Parker's sixtieth birthday gives colleagues occasion to bring flowers and champagne to reception celebrating the Third Phase, and the next night the House toasts the Fourth Phase in Montmartre before going to another colleague's home for a surprise Vietnamese dinner.

Contradiction: Broadening the horizons of House members at the same time as broadening those of the rest of the Regional Team. (Wk.9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Third session of *Third Wave* study group is led in French by a participant and another volunteers for next session. Participation in a "Public Enquiry in Social Injustice" leads to invitation for further involvement. One of the Teachers Association that meets in the House comes to lunch and pledges every Thursday afternoon to "anything that needs to be done."

Internal: Hosting the founders of *CERAN*, unique and most prestigious language institute in Belgium, reveals their deep understanding of the importance of community living, and promises well for a deep collegial (and lucrative commercial) relationship in the future. House celebrates the completion of four papers that cover arenas of rationality (strategy), sociality (five foundations), sexuality (role of Women's Revolution) and phasiality (journey of second phase) in time for Panchayat trek.

Contradiction: Clarifying and using new imaginal and accessible poetry that holds together the archaic, futuric, comprehensive intentions of all that is breaking loose. (Wk.7)

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Ludwigshafen — HDZ target — momentum continues to build as 25 people come to meeting concerning the *auslander* (foreigners/guestworkers) issues. Four new people join core committed to training and spearheading comprehensive care.

Internal: Jon Considine goes to Paris for Week II to staff VOW (Volunteer Orientation Weekend), and returns with new insights on the role of working with volunteers.

Contradiction: Empowering real colloquy priorities by forcing creativity with troop limits. (Wk.7)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: House moves into second phase of recruitment for Primal Community Fortnight with phoning, mailing and visits. Team writes articles for newsletter and mails out 16 volunteer packets to volunteers, their parents, and other Houses and nexus locations. Training-translation evening for the upcoming Religious Orders Seminar involves colleagues from Holland and Brussels in planning for the event in Antwerp.

Internal: After encountering Dutch culture through a trip, visit to a neighbor and Dutch lessons, neighborhood grand opening of McDonald's provides House with opportunity to celebrate as prelude to planning for Regional Team meeting.

Contradiction: Deciding to be chaste, with focused flexibility; in the midst of being chased by immense possibility. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Three from Berlin Regional Team participate in Frankfurt Regional Colloquy and share insights on packaging while marketing programs in English to U.S. military, multi-nationals and international groups.

Internal: The one left at home hosts former volunteer visiting in Berlin and plans for youth training event in Hamburg this Week II.

Contradiction: Standing before possibility of long range (from Colloquy) while deciding on next three necessary steps. (Wk. 9)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: February Seminar for Effective Mission is held with eight nations represented. Presentation to the *Womens Urbano Collegio* initiates a one-day seminar scheduled for April. Team visits the Knights of Labour to recruit students for March Formation Colloquy.

Internal: Self-support PSU is held with Mary Myers and Charles Moore from Brussels Nexus; they arrive in time to join Fr. Martel and Filippo Cortesi at guest night. Fat Tuesday is celebrated with pancakes, costumes and beer.

Contradiction: Seeing quickly key tactics that will allow the Formation Colloquy, seminars and self-support to all fill up. (Wk. 8)

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: W.H.O. librarian, Anotoinette Mercier, comes to dinner at House and expresses enthusiasm for ICA participatory workshop method. Urban district primary health care construct is completed and presented to Dr. Vouri as part of model for 1982-83 urban reseach programme.

Internal: House revises budget projections and anticipates breaking through the surface by July!

Contradiction: Weaving together story of new urban programme thrust to enable framing and seed funds. (Wk. 8)

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

Contradiction: Creating self-support modes that will accelerate the program. (Wk. 9)

**EDMONTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Final mass mailing for Prairie Potential Regional Consult is completed while Americas Challenge appointments continue as Parkland County Continued Education coordinator contacts House for appointment.

Internal: House welcomes Amaid from Libya (sojourner in the Winnipeg House) for five days of visiting western Canada in the midst of two major strikes and continued cold weather.

Contradiction: Covering all the aspects necessary in the time allowed. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER**

External: Wayne Ellsworth visits to firm up Eaton's LENS and do intensive week of marketing with 16 calls held. Americas Challenge and this week's calls birth need to do demonstration LENS process with initial response creating need to hold two seminars of 20 participants each. Call with B.C. Research discovers a collegial institution that wants to talk more about collaborative work and the possibility of using their network to market ICA programs.

Internal: Regional Team symbolizes transition to new priorship with professional framing of decor, passing on of financial systems, sending 1981 audit materials to Montreal, and holding grand send-out celebration for the Oberg's of Chinese food served Japanese style.

Contradiction: Creating catalytic atmosphere around the programmatic thrust that increases momentum already established. (Wk. 8)

Contradiction: Managing overloaded support systems (characterized by chronic car troubles) which threaten programmatic "brown-out". (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

Internal: Visit to local foundation in Oklahoma City reveals new possibility for self-support.

Contradiction: Articulating and living out of a plan for rest of the century in particularity of confusion and uncertainty about regional focus. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Shizu Sato brings greetings from Oyubari to Pace Mayor and residents and tours town in Japanese kimono. Molly and Shizu make eight visits in Jackson, Mississippi, uncovering two LENS prospects, one funding source and setting two Black Engagement Strategy appointments. President of Tougaloo College sends letter indicating interest in LENS process.

Internal: Michael Shaw's parents visit and delight House by purchasing and preparing House Church meal. House celebrates Ari Sato's birthday and Freemans give VW to Jay Zahrt.

Contradiction: Pulling together isolated plans and models to use troops effectively and give focus and intensify missional thrust. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Sheila Bailey joins Sharon Turner of Continental Black Engagement Strategies Team in conducting Dialogue on the Family in Edgard with members of Fr. Winus Roeten's congregation. Carolyn Wells assists in two dialogues set-up by Eunice Royal and Noreen Hall in Covington for Headstart teachers and local women. Lunch with Charity Hospital's Quality Work Life Team results in depth dialogue. Carlos Zervigon reports on Caracas RS-1.

Internal: Leila McKay announces new teaching job begins Monday.

Contradiction: Moving into new weekly design with attention to care for human situation as well as enabling Black Engagement Strategy events and Health PSU participation. (Wk. 9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: St. Timothy's Priorship Training sessions wind-up with all-day session Saturday as McDonald's Managers Training has another O/O hop on board. \$1,000 arrives from Richmond County Rural Communities, up-front consult fee. Community of Hartwell, Georgia, expresses intention to deal with its future and requests programs for planning and leadership training before grant monies are recalled. Black Engagement Strategy Team Dinner ends with four families covenanting as a core and agreeing to meet in two weeks to work out interview plans.

Internal: High House Church celebrates new leap in Lorimor corporateness and decision with Bill Gooch, Bill Westre and Bob Booher. Bob Booher and Dick West celebrate same March 5th birth date.

Contradiction: Formulating the Lorimor/Midcrest/ICA story to enable the development process and inform House's own market strategy. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: New three-year proposal for St. Paul Central High School Student Leadership program is completed and submitted to Inter-north Corporation in Omaha, Nebraska; proposal leads toward revolution in education according to high school principal. Contradiction: Coalescing individual concerns of Fourth Street into Regional Team effort to see that it succeeds. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Representatives of five nations and three major world religions gather for an Evening with the Institute at the residence of Anthony and Hilde Betonte in Morgantown, West Virginia. Area Guardians Trek brings to consciousness the Guardian role as Joan Seacord of New York meets Dan and Jane Moore of Huntington, West Virginia. Shrove Tuesday pancake Roundtable impacts lyricist of "We are in a New World Now" with the emerging paradigm.

Internal: Pittsburgh permeators top \$50,000 in self-support income.

Contradiction: Objectifying missional reality to allow structural care for the entire Region. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Workshop on Art Form method with entire staff of Troy Public Library includes Ken DeWeaver from Rochester on leadership team. Jan Ulangca reports many working contacts from treks to Buffalo and Ithaca. At Evening with the Institute, Jan shows slides of Panchayat trek to young professionals in Ithaca.

Contradiction: Playing in a new ballgame while inventing the rules and recruiting the team members. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Finding time to pause to get a strategic focus on team's work in Azpitia. (Wk. 7)\*

## **CARACAS**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: Tremendous RS-I is held with old and new members of Regional Team. Caracas Ecclesiola begins study in Spanish of *The Third Wave*. Cano Negro hosts site visits from national literacy program, guardian coordinator for sewing industry and Paul Bosch, Caracas financial consultant.

Internal: Kip May reports to Cano Negro gathering of 25 on the Jamaica Consult inspiring collegiums on Barlovento industrial holding company and upcoming school and consult.

Contradiction: Discerning the actual receptivity of the Cluster villages and government structures before the Consult event. (Wk. 8)\*

Doctors Otilia Marina and Kathy Kelly (dentist) arrive from Madison, Wisconsin, for "Health Week in Sol" which is prepared by health advocates with inkind articles from local drug companies and great support from the Mayor's office. Preschool teachers turn out en masse, and Isobel Urrutia does the second workshop session of Imaginal Education.

Internal: House plans great celebration as first retirement check (retroactive) arrives.

Contradiction: Organizing the effulgent feast into digestible bites. (Wk. 7)

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: Eneida Andrade returns from Portugal and France and gives reports on the Lamego HDTI and the Paris Volunteer Orientation Weekend.

Internal: Three days of intensive Portuguese study in the House concentrates on verbs and singing the new Roberto Carlos album. Five days of Carnival discontinuity have the House dancing in the streets in Rio and Rio Bonito.

Contradiction: Putting practical content into rest of the quarter's plan for intensification of the Bracana area of the municipality so that the municipal team can be fully engaged. (Wk. 8)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that CIDA remits second payment of \$14,000 for Jamaica and that Union Oil notifies Manila that the HK \$85,000 grant is approved with the first payment scheduled for March, 1982. Chicago Nexus mails an Indian "Bridge" poster to the North American religious constituency. Geographic coverage intensifies in Tokyo with visits to all three regions and in USA with attention to out lying metros. The key contradiction lies in the arena of objectifying both cash in hand and frame maneuvers completed.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that two ES-I courses are staffed, the Global Academy registrations reach 64 and space is renovated, the Quarter IV Roundtable constructs for the Muse and Dialogue are completed, and the Health PSU reporting collegium is held. Hong Kong reports doing 18-month projection for Seoul Region and documentation on Chou Wn Cluster Project. Breakthroughs include the assignment of Doug Retteg and Jan Sanders to the Global Academy faculty and the creation of a 4x4x4 on the Chinese Probe paper in Hong Kong. The key contradiction lies in the arena of troops imaged as locked into overwhelming number of specialized tasks which eclipses possibility of blitz maneuvers and reveals inadequacy of sequential and individualistic assignments.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that programme assignments require much attention across the band as the increase of programmatic activity both continentally and regionally place heavy demands upon existing leadership. Twenty regional, areal, continental and global colleagues gather for LENS facilitator training for six community LENS programs in the West Virginia Community Cluster Experiment. Breakthroughs include Town Meeting training with 17 Youth Club members which allow direct work of Operations and Research Centurms in Hong Kong with the region in formulating the Training Phase of the region's plan. North America is experiencing a meteorific mood breakloose of being on the move again programmatically. The key contradiction lies in the arena of the immediate activity of existing, bold programmatic events precluding long-range strategizing and positioning.

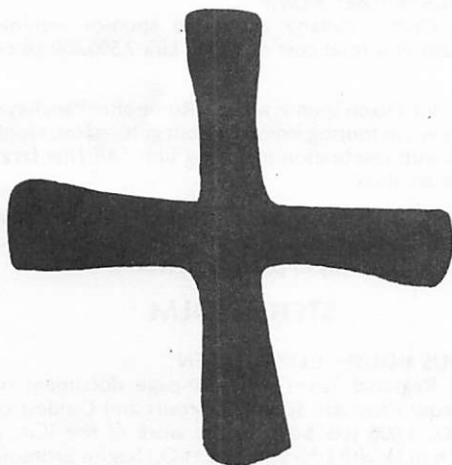
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that the Publishing House prints the religious constituency mailing (poster and letter), the ICA Executive Committee meets, team inkind 100 cases of Campbell's products, and the fourth floor of the International Training Center is shining for Global Academy readiness. Legal meetings give concrete form to restructuring necessary for Hong Kong E.I. and ICA. Breakthroughs include visit to Immigration in Chicago relative to staff visas and the Order Roster is being updated and cleaned by family numbers and alphabet. The contradiction lies in the arena of having inadequate systems and tools for dealing with the gap between escalating programme demands and lagging support systems, especially funding — the struggle of being revolutionary in finances and still functional.

Internal: Five-eighths of House is present during most of the week, culminating in a serious Roundtable study, conversation and Vocational Journey exercise.

Contradiction: Securing three more LENS for April. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Implementation meetings in five villages with assignments to do visible signs elicit high enthusiasm from the local people. First "greenhouse" is already completed by one iron man in Mezio. Visit to Minister of Education and Youth in Lisboa nets promise to obtain three yearly salaries for Portuguese volunteers.

Internal: Luz Marina Aponte is received as Intern in the Order during visit of Panchayat; Branca and Jeronima join three young Portuguese men as full-time volunteers; and Fr. Marcel talks with Archbishop and Vicar about structural relationship between ICA and the Church.

Contradiction: Ensuring that ten enduring visible signs in ten villages are celebrated before April 4th. (Wk. 9)\*

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

Fine four-sector event sparks the imagination of many of the 35 guests present who had to choose between viewing the global film or the premiere showing of the Isle of Dogs slide show.

Internal: LENS pedagogy gets House ready for the "real thing" with demonstration LENS and voluntary sector LENS scheduled for coming week.

Nurture of long standing colleagues goes on with visit to Fraser and Helen Patrick and David and Rosemary Fleming, resulting in Rosemary saying yes to taking part in School Leavers Forum the end of March.

Internal: House experiences victory over poverty life style by attending local jumble sale and becoming proud owners of carpet sweeper and electric clothes drier.

Contradiction: Finding gimmicks that allow House to take the necessary risks for success of the external mission and holding in tension internal demands. (Wk. 10)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: House hosts Lenten ecumenical study group. Potential volunteer (a teacher from local school) visits House for dinner, brings gift and gets to know more about ICA.

Internal: House team attends local church committee meeting, jumble sale and concert.

Contradiction: Clarifying strategic death ground to make best use of scheduled programmes. (Wk. 10)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three men who work in *informatics* (word processing, computer technology) take part in Roundtable which uses reading from *The World Challenge* as reference for discussion. The dialogue continues in two English classes. Art form conversation on a piece of music is the program for fifth monthly English Evening. Desmond Avery does LENS in London with a social service employment agency.

Internal: Beverly Parker's sixtieth birthday gives colleagues occasion to bring flowers and champagne to reception celebrating the Third Phase, and the next night the House toasts the Fourth Phase in Montmartre before going to another colleague's home for a surprise Vietnamese dinner.

Contradiction: Broadening the horizons of House members at the same time as broadening those of the rest of the Regional Team. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Another busy week with local team from Zellik seeing film and forum with "People to People" group. LENS calls happen through contacts other than a direct approach. Teachers group has its usual 25 enthusiasts at monthly meeting and is followed by all-day Saturday exhibition of groups journey at a language fair at the *Atomium* during which time another 100 or so sign up for metro meetings.

Internal: House collegiums focus on the forthcoming continental P.S.U. on Women which will utilize new weekend course for women.

Contradiction: Finding time to do "humanness studies" when all are present versus being consumed with awakenment or research that is not corporately shared. (Wk. 10)\*

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Volunteer Orientation Weekend is occasion for eight potential volunteers to experience methods they would use in the third world as well as in their sojourn in the House prior to their trip — one volunteer phones Amsterdam House Monday morning to ask when he could move in. Weekend leadership is augmented by John Whitesell, Florida. Self-support exploration yields a key call with Colonel in American Army who is responsible for all support services and results in keen interest in LENS methods and Town Meeting.

Internal: Yvonne Stringham returns from IERD planning meeting and July preparation meeting in India and shares news with the House with an Indian meal as backdrop for excitement over the future directions.

Contradiction: Bringing creative focus to *immediate tactics* in self-support and Formation Fortnight recruitment in midst of seeing middle and long-range breakthroughs. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: House moves into second phase of recruitment for Primal Community Fortnight with phoning, mailing and visits. Team writes articles for newsletter and mails out 16 volunteer packets to volunteers, their parents, and other Houses and nexus locations. Training-translation evening for the upcoming Religious Orders Seminar involves colleagues from Holland and Brussels in planning for the event in Antwerp.

Internal: After encountering Dutch culture through a trip, visit to a neighbor and Dutch lessons, neighborhood grand opening of McDonald's provides House with opportunity to celebrate as prelude to planning for Regional Team meeting.

Contradiction: Deciding to be chaste, with focused flexibility; in the midst of being chased by immense possibility. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Three from Berlin Regional Team participate in Frankfurt Regional Colloquy and share insights on packaging while marketing programs in English to U.S. military, multi-nationals and international groups.

Internal: The one left at home hosts former volunteer visiting in Berlin and plans for youth training event in Hamburg this Week II.

Contradiction: Standing before long range possibility (from Colloquy) while deciding on next three necessary steps. (Wk. 9)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: *Caritas Italiana* agrees to sponsor seminar for seminarians at a total cost of Italian Lira 2,500,000 (about US \$2,000).

Internal: Joe Dixon spends week in Rome after Panchayat trek and succeeds in touring Rome without getting lost. House fast day ends with celebration including film "All That Jazz" and attending art show.

Contradiction: Figuring out a releasing strategy that will enable marketing versus recruitment (of Imaginal Education seminar and Colloquy in particular). (Wk. 9)\*

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Regional Team writes 20-page document on the Urban Scout Program. *Spejders* (Scouts and Guides) contribute D.Kr. 3,000 (US \$400) to the work of the ICA. Alona Kickbusch in Health Education (W.H.O.) begins promotion of the Urban Health seminar for intersectoral coordination.

Internal: With the arrival of spring, House sweeps clean Area finances and prepares garden for planting.

Contradiction: Allowing this boat to sail through the *symplegedes* of self-support, finance and missional opportunities. (Wk. 9)\*

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: During a week of mailings, documentation is sent to participants of the Neuwaldegg Seminar, Formation Fortnight announcements and a letter from a participant last year is sent to targeted list of 60. A letter announcing Roundtable is written and translated. External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

## ABIDJAN

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: A week of practical methods training for delegates from the Cluster villages begins, stops, then begins again as the participants finally make the decision to pay the registration fee.

Internal: Another hotel English course brings in additional, much needed, income.

External: LENS marketing blitz initiated with telephoning and nine appointments demonstrates openness and interest in the programme. One telephone call uncovers colleague, appointment and US \$2,750 commitment. Two programmes are marketed to University of Lagos, Adult Education Department for HDP workshop and Imaginal Education.

Internal: Guest night with four colleagues and corporateness collegium stimulate lively discussions on the times we live in and who we are as a community in these times.

Contradiction: Keeping the external thrust and internal support in creative tension. (Wk. 10)\*

External: Diamond of Zambia preschools swell to 411 children as the House prepares to light the fourth fire by launching the fourth preschool. Diamond of Zambia preschool teachers attend "mat making" session in Kapini led by women from Kapini Village Women's Industry. Development team visits all the banks in Lusaka, and the newly opened Citibank donates K 250 immediately. Kapini visibility improves as flowering trees are planted and Air India agrees to donate the expenses of the mural painting on the HDTs walls.

Internal: House celebrates the Ford's return from the garage after four months of disrepair and prepares newsletter for supporters and colleagues in the Region.

Contradiction: Keeping programmatic momentum going in midst of overwhelming possibilities and limited troops. (Wk. 9)\*

External: In historical Area Council highlighted by tremendous address by Lyn Mathews and Mupti Chief to 54 HDTI grads, two and three-year staff members are honored and new HDP, Ikuyani, staff are commissioned. Lyn and Mrs. Basam shore up frame through lunch with Mrs. Tom Mboya, the permanent representative to UN Habitat, and Graham Ballard, member of ICA Board of Advice and Review, and tea with Sir Humphrey Slade, former head of Parliament. Impact training begins with 100 ICA and 20 village leaders for Mitaboni and Masii locations.

Internal: House receives Marian Basam and Lyn Mathews from India and Joe Slicker back from the Panchayat Trek; then with most of the House gone to Area Council, the youth are left in charge of House and E.G.

Contradiction: Redesigning space, task and assignments to empower new thrust of Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)\*

Internal: House joins "Feast of Santo Minro" in Cebu, one of year's biggest events. House sends some to new assignments.

Contradiction: Figuring how to move quickly in order to have catalytic group in the midst of having four big arenas with which to work. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO****TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: George Kawai reports to Tokyo advisors on IERD Bombay meeting. Mr. Kaoru Harada, advisor, goes to Sapporo to teach LENS. Contradiction: Looking into the spring quarter programs and seeing hazy fog instead of clear blue sky. (Wk. 11)\*

External: Korea ITI hooks up with steering committee meeting which targets 500 plus grad mailing for invitations to rally celebrating ten years of EI/ICA presence in Seoul Region.

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON**

External: Cluster makes economic moves with the two villages sending \$3000 to the Australian Embassy, who will add \$3000 and purchase cattle scales and return a portion for cattle. The Cluster also makes an investment in fruit trees, decides to purchase seeds corporately, and comes for training in raising vegetables. While development money goes into projects, guests — Telford and Hockley and a vice president of Lucky Company — come to talk of more development support.

Internal: House welcomes two young men, Park Seong Kwan and Ahn Cheol Woo, university graduates in civil engineering and agriculture, who plan to sojourn for three months.

Contradiction: Following up planning and training events with coordinated catalytic action. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: What a week! Bishop Joe Iida stops by twice to go over plans for training leaders for a 60-person planning event and while here he meets Oboson Kenji, a Buddhist Priest who arranged highly successful Buddhist Town Meeting last year. Three new people participate in the largest yet Roundtable where a guest brings her Mexican Chihuahua. Highly successful Regional Team meeting works in three task teams to lay out concentrated plans for next six months and concludes with showing of the global film and a fine meal.

Internal: House Town Meeting, designed to train staff and volunteers, turns into an exciting five-session planning time; House celebrates seeing "Eye of The Needle", a fine movie. Motor bike is given to House by English student, now a Resident Volunteer in Tokyo.

Contradiction: Implementing, coordinating and staffing Region's plans for next six months. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: The Town Meeting in Moriyama is taped by NHK TV and three minutes are broadcast on NHK news. Sakai City Chamber of Commerce hosts three-hour demonstration LENS workshop and 17 business people attend, opening yet another door for future LENS. The beginning of the Philippines Third World Trip is signalled with two-hour context followed by Sunday House Celebration which all 12 participants attend.

Internal: Assignments collegiums remind House of (and is new information for some) the scope of the assignments process as well as the care that is required of the group on behalf of the world and the individuals involved.

Contradiction: Maintaining an effective balance between demands of the Region and demands of the nation. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO**

Contradiction: Having fun doing the LENS course through symbolic reflection and celebration. (Wk. 9)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Circuit to Newcastle includes Annual Appeal appointments and a core meeting which generates great excitement about future events in Newcastle Metro. Sydney appointments produce three more corporations seriously considering LENS and a facility possibility that shifts House's entire strategy about a training centre.

Contradiction: Maturing second wave of community leadership to enable a new depth of responsibility. (Wk. 10)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Two State Department Youth Education Officers visit House to set up event on enhancing Student Council effectiveness and to share insights on methods.

Internal: Rory Gowers receives academic credit at W. A. Institute of Technology for his ICA work experience and is now in second-year level for some of his courses.

Contradiction: Moving on plan to have each team member spend some time in-house during Day I. (Wk. 10)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

Internal: House experiments with a sung Daily Office.

Contradiction: Appropriating victorious living. (Wk. 10)\*

Contradiction: Laying tracks under a speeding train. (Wk. 9)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AGANA**

Contradiction: Creating the story which releases funds and troops to meet overwhelming demands. (Wk. 8)

External: Documentation work continues in Sanger completing four months of implementation after community LENS. Formation of Health and Education Guild research continues with appointments in the Bay Area. Watsonville LENS spurs new programmatic activity.

Internal: New sense of collegiality emerges as Regional Team participates in Roundtable, House Church, breakfast collegium and daily appointments.

Contradiction: Holding the balance of reflection and different internal time design while seeing the necessity of setting program before summer. (Wk. 10)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Regional Team redesigns and mails Cultural Revolution Seminar brochure for upcoming course, April 2-4, as launch of "The Event Horizon (as in blackholes) Maneuver". Contradiction: Clarifying the specifics of the task in order to engage all the troops. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PISINEMO**

External: Twelve from Purdue University spend a week in Pisinemo on a work project. Three workers are added to farm payroll as VISTA support comes to an end.

Internal: House takes advantage of first Week II without visitors since Christmas to do a thorough house cleaning.

Contradiction: Greasing the business cash flow system, especially when major accounts are tied to tribal accounting office. (Wk. 10)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

External: Cannon Ball Industries, Inc., manufacturer of livestock handling equipment, succeeds tremendously at Agricultural Exposition in Minot, North Dakota. \$60,000 worth of work orders are in hand and another \$50,000 are in negotiation for spring production.

Metro Team colleagues and weekend sojourner empower Update mailing and February Meeting.

Internal: Blue mashed potatoes, multi-colored corn and green milk served up by youth in surprise menu for Fat Tuesday set stage for observance of Ash Wednesday.

Contradiction: Managing overloaded support systems (characterized by chronic car troubles) which threaten programmatic "brown-out". (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: Oaklawn Community Meeting in Dallas and RS-I in Bartlesville engage local troops and Regional Team in new postures of care.

Internal: Visit to local foundation in Oklahoma City reveals new possibility for self-support.

Contradiction: Articulating and living out of a plan for rest of the century in particularity of confusion and uncertainty about regional focus. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

Internal: Michael Shaw's parents visit and delight House by purchasing and preparing House Church meal. House celebrates Ari Sato's birthday and Freemans give VW to Jay Zahrt.

Contradiction: Pulling together isolated plans and models to use troops effectively and give focus and intensify missional thrust. (Wk. 9)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Black Engagement Strategies Team's "Leadership Styles for the '80s" drains Quality Work Life Forum grads from Charity Hospital and Belle Chasse State School together with other course grads for two-day event. Family Lab with 12 preschool teachers results in decision of director to conduct another of the same for arch-diocese. ### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO**

House participates in LENS facilitator training in Chicago, and first *Update* of 1982 is mailed. Contradiction: Tying down three scheduled programs while establishing crowded Black Engagement team schedule, which will break open new relationships. (Wk. 9)

Internal: With computer manual completed, additional computer terminal is inkinded for Computer Users Lab held during Week II resulting in eight trained computer operators for the Regional Team.

Contradiction: Allowing total Region to participate in the new breakloose in program and spirit rather than dancing on edges of old stories and old engagement patterns. (Wk. 11)\*

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Metro planning evening sets arenas for Quarter IV activity.

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

More than 30 people are expected for February 11th Second Annual Guardians' Meeting during Panchayat trek. Internal: Second Fireside Forum, featuring priest and Dean within Anglican Church, Toronto, offers insight into history and current struggles of House's new neighbourhood, the Kensington community. House participates in a Saturday workday with the local community renovating the San Camilo Community Centre.

Internal: A quiet but very grateful celebration follows the decision by the Oblate Fathers to support the ICA through the rest of the year.

Contradiction: Utilizing initial victories with the local and religious sectors to catalyze the participation of the public and private sectors. (Wk. 10)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

## HAVANA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Week of curriculum writing produces four manuals and a song book for the upcoming Cluster Leadership Seminar. Cluster circuiting enables the first cluster Stake Night and continued recruitment for the CLS. ICA attends Ministry of Youth and Community Development workshop on the Comprehensive Rural Township Development Programme as the only non-governmental organization. House members attend dinner party at home of the U.S. Embassy Deputy Chief of Mission. Staff and Regional Team members conduct second part of Youth Leadership Workshop for St. Thomas (targeted HDZ). Cluster Leadership Seminar begins with global film at the Bath Foundation Hotel in Eastern St. Thomas.

Internal: House members host Deaconess Forbes and her staff at a Chinese dinner to say "thank you" for four years of free office space and continued sleeping space in Kingston.

Contradiction: Inventing cluster curriculum and writing procedures using wisdom from India, Kenya, etc., making it tailor-made for first Jamaican cluster and yet on behalf of the Western Hemisphere..(Wk. 10)\*

## LIMA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Children's one-week summer program is directed by six colleagues from Lima. Valley circuit returns with Roundtables scheduled for future weeks. Honey harvest begins, and preparation for LENS pedagogy begins. Health circuit teaches 46 health promoters representing eight communities.

Internal: Edith Larsen returns with her husband for a visit to Azpitia and treats the House to a trip to the Gold Museum and a Chinese lunch.

Contradiction: Finding time to pause to get a strategic focus on team's work in Azpitia. (Wk. 7)

## CARACAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Second Human Development Methods Lab begins with 35 full-time participants from 12 villages to be represented in the upcoming Cluster Consult. Over US \$3,000 of inkind is picked up with much more to come. Dr. Lara's 70th birthday is celebrated at businessmen's guild meeting.

Internal: Norris Ladely arrives from Jamaica for school and Cluster Consult; Alex Featherstone is sent out after three-month sojourn; and three return safely from four-hour adventure of a stuck truck in a river in the middle of the jungle.

Contradiction: Learning to render into powerful tactics what is available and what is necessary. (Wk. 10)\*

## BUENOS AIRES

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Three exciting visits — one with Mayor, one with Mayor's wife, and the other with Chilean Vice President of American Express International Banking Corporation — reveal interest in providing agricultural, health and financial expertise for HDS in May, 1982.

Internal: Dave Thomas enlives Santiago House with a three-day visit on his way to Argentina and Uruguay, and House enjoys a great Chinese meal with colleague as kickoff for next Roundtable paper on China.

Contradiction: Symbolizing the thrust by adding form to the situational chaos. (Wk. 10)\*

## **RIO DE JANEIRO**

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

**External:** Great week of signal accomplishments begins with a surprise as good article on ICA work appears in one of Brazil's leading newspapers. Then a key Rio Bonito Municipal team meeting reaches a basis concensus on plans to do a Community Planning Series in the Bracana area (two communities) in April and a series of Community Forums in another area in June. Later in the week a "festa" is pulled off by eight team members to celebrate the start of a sewing course in Bracana. Saturday Study Methods Lab for Baptist young adult group introduces 18 to basic methods, and Sao Paulo Hilton agrees to provide four nights of accommodation for Week 11 trip to contact Japanese companies.

**Internal:** Highlights include the much delayed send out of Alberto Rosario to join his family in Chicago and Jessica Krauss's fourth birthday party which turns into a riotous House open house with 25 people.

**Contradiction:** Ensuring necessary completion of critical tasks while figuring out new configurations. (Wk. 9)\*

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Hong Kong receives contributions of \$18,700 from 14 corporations and \$12,000 from USAID, Chicago Nexus mails an Indian "Bridge" poster to the North American religious constituency, Alberta Province will match contributions of 1981, and ten new LENS are working in Kuala Lumpur and Sydney. Notification of \$23,000 bequest spurs Chicago deferred giving manoeuvres. The key contradiction lies in the arena of transforming victories with Annual Appeal, programme breakloose and major city emphases into new contacts.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that the first draft is completed on *IMAGE: Human Motivity*, the Global Academy floor is prepared for 70 participants and 20 faculty, and the Quarter IV Roundtable is sent to the print shop. Centrum discovers that articulating the urgent demand releases the task so that necessary jobs get done. The key contradiction lies in the arena of having limited gimmicks to significate the urgency and cruciality of the task.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that the LPSES LENS is scheduled with approval of the Indonesian Government, the Ford Foundation and Burns Phelps. LENS seminars are set in Apia for March. Six Community LENS events in West Virginia, the West Virginia Community Cluster Experiment, captures momentum for multi-sector participation. Tonga invites the ICA to open ICA center in Tonga and Fiji. Council of Churches invites and sponsors Pacific Training School in December, 1982. The key contradiction lies in the arena of picturing the overview image of Quarter IV and articulating the base for its operational thrust.

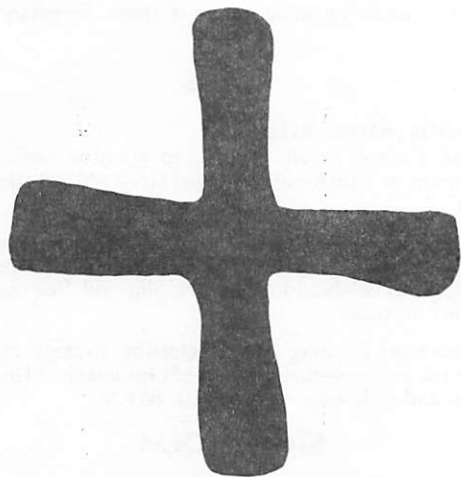
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that servicing Regions Agana, Apia and Ujung Pandang receive major emphasis as phone call from Bushmans and TASK money from Agana results in large packet and House check being sent to Suva, and Chicago responds to need by sending Art Smith and Barbara Hawley to Majuro. Inkind victories continue for Global Academy readiness. July '82 is approaching — O:E Finance begins March stipend run including camp deductions, first of three. Preparing for the USA audit involves reconciliations and functionalization. The key contradiction lies in the arena of standing before the deadline of receiving programme cheques and paying expenses while struggling with deadlines of self-support, March follow-up, and financial statements and reports.

Visit from mayor of Utrilla (Soria) and setting in kind appointments for old-age home in Navares de Enmedio (Segovia) highlight role of ICA as linking up local communities with public and private sectors.

Internal: House sends out Frank to Portugal as well as Barbara and Lucas. Week II is spent in long-range dreaming for future of mission in Iberia.

Contradiction: Ensuring plans to build local manpower network to make the dreams a reality. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Implementation meetings in five villages with assignments to do visible signs elicit high enthusiasm from the local people. First "greenhouse" is already completed by one iron man in Mezio. Visit to Minister of Education and Youth in Lisboa nets promise to obtain three yearly salaries for Portuguese volunteers.

Internal: Luz Marina Aponte is received as Intern in the Order during visit of Panchayat; Branca and Jeronima join three young Portuguese men as full-time volunteers; and Fr. Marcel talks with Archbishop and Vicar about structural relationship between ICA and the Church.

Contradiction: Ensuring that ten enduring visible signs in ten villages are celebrated before April 4th. (Wk. 9)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Formation Fortnight recruitment continues with three more yeses bringing total to fifteen participants. Martha arrives for 1981 Charitable Trust (ICA) audit and Amal is sent to Bristol Region to teach that region's second Volunteer Orientation Weekend of the year.

Internal: Area Council is highlighted by transposition exercises on Thomas A. Kempis, and House hunt is reactivated upon receiving April 17th deadline to move.

External: Spring begins to take effect as enquiries into Volunteer Orientation Weekend (V.O.W.) come in from three corners of Scotland. Development visits to Paisley renew contacts after four years and spark interest in LENS. Visit to Ken Mathers of YMCA International Board results in proposed strategy for ICA's introduction into the heart of Glasgow.

Internal: As House continues to confront the self-support storm by sending Sylvia and Jean to London for a look at the audit and Area Council, two rays of light shine through with a super annuation check and a part time church organist/choir master position.

Contradiction: Gearing up for the frontal approach on local involvement. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Bristol circuit creates possible entree to bring Training, Inc. to the U.K. The regional faculty teaches V.O.W. with Amal Morcos and confirms new colleagues in local school and U.K. Boy Scout movement. First yes is received for Formation Fortnight participation.

Internal: Volunteers create silliest celebration in V.O.W. programme history with full range of "boy scout tricks".

Contradiction: Building platform for launching Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three men who work in *informatics* (word processing, computer technology) take part in Roundtable which uses reading from *The World Challenge* as reference for discussion. The dialogue continues in two English classes. Art form conversation on a piece of music is the program for fifth monthly English Evening. Desmond Avery does LENS in London with a social service employment agency.

\* NOTE: The \* indicates the first printing of a new report.

Internal: Beverly Parker's sixtieth birthday gives colleagues occasion to bring flowers and champagne to reception celebrating the Third Phase, and the next night the House toasts the Fourth Phase in Montmartre before going to another colleague's home for a surprise Vietnamese dinner.

Contradiction: Broadening the horizons of House members at the same time as broadening those of the rest of the Regional Team. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS**

External: Religious Order Seminar in Antwerp extends feasibility of this kind of event, sharing with colleagues and profound care.

Internal: Anna has first week of full-time employment.

Contradiction: Making Council both the needed spirit happening and needed fortnight preparation. (Wk. 9)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Another busy week with local team from Zellik seeing film and forum with "People to People" group. LENS calls happen through contacts other than a direct approach. Teachers group has its usual 25 enthusiasts at monthly meeting and is followed by all-day Saturday exhibition of groups journey at a language fair at the *Atomium* during which time another 100 or so sign up for metro meetings.

Internal: House collegiums focus on the forthcoming continental P.S.U. on Women which will utilize new weekend course for women.

Contradiction: Finding time to do "humanness studies" when all are present versus being consumed with awakening or research that is not corporately shared. (Wk. 10)

### **FRANKFURT**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Volunteer Orientation Weekend is occasion for eight potential volunteers to experience methods they would use in the third world as well as in their sojourn in the House prior to their trip — one volunteer phones Amsterdam House Monday morning to ask when he could move in. Weekend leadership is augmented by John Whitesell, Florida. Self-support exploration yields a key call with Colonel in American Army who is responsible for all support services and results in keen interest in LENS methods and Town Meeting.

Internal: Yvonne Stringham returns from IERD planning meeting and July preparation meeting in India and shares news with the House with an Indian meal as backdrop for excitement over the future directions.

Contradiction: Bringing creative focus to *immediate tactics* in self-support and Formation Fortnight recruitment in midst of seeing middle and long-range breakthroughs. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Jan Joosten, Frank Little and Anja Bos represent the Regional Team traveling to Brussels and evaluating the recently taught Imaginal Methods course in a Religious Order Seminar; Jan and Frank were faculty. This is in preparation for a course scheduled in the Netherlands in May in Dutch. The House works with Development Centrum to write a proposal to fund the course through the NCO, a Dutch international development funding agency. A visit with Don van Heren, Director of the Commission for the Church in Society underscores Reformed Church concern for urban.

Internal: Kees Wiertz arrives for two-week sojourn in training as preparation to volunteer in Portugal. China study at Roundtable reminds House of the ancient prejudice between men and women and the victimization of the people by the elite.

Contradiction: Counterbalancing four-year strategic components of the vision with next quarter's plan and the immediate live possibilities knocking at the door. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

External: Three from Berlin Regional Team participate in Frankfurt Regional Colloquy and share insights on packaging while marketing programs in English to U.S. military, multi-nationals and international groups.

Internal: The one left at home hosts former volunteer visiting in Berlin and plans for youth training event in Hamburg this Week II.

Contradiction: Standing before long range possibility (from Colloquy) while deciding on next three necessary steps. (Wk. 9)

### **ROME**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: *Caritas Italiana* agrees to sponsor seminar for seminarians at a total cost of Italian Lira 2,500,000 (about US \$2,000).

Internal: Joe Dixon spends week in Rome after Panchayat trek and succeeds in touring Rome without getting lost. House fast day ends with celebration including film "All That Jazz" and attending art show.

Contradiction: Figuring out a releasing strategy that will enable marketing versus recruitment (of Imaginal Education seminar and Colloquy in particular). (Wk. 9)

### **STOCKHOLM**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Regional Team writes 20-page document on the Urban Scout Program. *Spejders* (Scouts and Guides) contribute D.Kr. 3,000 (US \$400) to the work of the ICA. Alona Kickbusch in Health Education (W.H.O.) begins promotion of the Urban Health seminar for intersectoral coordination.

Internal: With the arrival of spring, House sweeps clean Area finances and prepares garden for planting.

Contradiction: Allowing this boat to sail through the *symplegedes* of self-support, finance and missional opportunities. (Wk. 9)

### **BUDAPEST**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: The Austrian frame gets a boost as references from an Austrian in the USA are followed up with Charles Moore. Proposed Statutes are reviewed with Management in Brussels as the last step in getting ready to apply to the Police and other government agencies for becoming a legal entity<sup>1</sup> in Austria.

Internal: House welcomes Charles Moore and John Whitesell and celebrates the 59th birthday of Ruthe Yost at House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping the motivity going while clapping with one hand due to reduced troop strength. (Wk. 11)\*

### **CAIRO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

## ABIDJAN

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: A week of practical methods training for delegates from the Cluster villages begins, stops, then begins again as the participants finally make decision to pay registration fee.

Internal: Another hotel English course brings in additional, much needed, income.

Contradiction: Implementing the necessary plan when foundational elements are shakey. (Wk. 10)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: LENS marketing blitz initiated with telephoning and nine appointments demonstrates openness and interest in the programme. One telephone call uncovers colleague, appointment and US \$2,750 commitment. Two programmes are marketed to University of Lagos, Adult Education Department for HDP workshop and Imaginal Education.

Internal: Guest night with four colleagues and corporateness collegium stimulate lively discussions on the times we live in and who we are as a community in these times.

Contradiction: Keeping the external thrust and internal support in creative tension. (Wk. 10)

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Diamond of Zambia preschools swell to 411 children as the House prepares to light the fourth fire by launching the fourth preschool. Diamond of Zambia preschool teachers attend "mat making" session in Kapini led by women from Kapini Village Women's Industry. Development team visits all the banks in Lusaka, and the newly opened Citibank donates K 250 immediately. Kapini visibility improves as flowering trees are planted and Air India agrees to donate the expenses of the mural painting on the HDTs walls.

Internal: House celebrates the Ford's return from the garage after four months of disrepair and prepares newsletter for supporters and colleagues in the Region.

Contradiction: Keeping programmatic momentum going in midst of overwhelming possibilities and limited troops. (Wk. 9)

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Mitaboni Location impact is completed in all 47 villages with 120 staff and 20 village leaders, and preparations begin immediately for Masii Location impact. ICA makes a presentation to all the District Agriculture Officers of Kenya in advance to ICA/World Bank/Kenya Government Agriculture Development Programme. President Daniel arap Moi initiates National Soil Conservation campaign in Muputi cluster village.

Internal: House experiences fullness as "first ever" three villagers join House for Health Care Training, staying and eating in house. House hosts Marian Bassam and Lyn Mathews for two dinners and send off to USA. Studies of *Critchfield's* article on Health Caretaker Monica Mutuli and Doug Wilson's paper on circuiting a DOOP give House new opportunities to articulate story.

Contradiction: Developing new funding strategies to break through the economic recession. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: South Tiriki holds first location meeting with over 100 people present. Talks are given by the Chief and the District Officer. The third Village Leadership Institute graduates 38 village leaders. Site selection team chooses two new district projects in West Pokot and Trans-Nzoia.

Internal: Section 'A' staff receives new troop Russell Lincoln from Area London one week after assigning Walter Heiges back to his books.

Contradiction: Becoming proficient in doing a location project when there is no rule of thumb. (Wk. 8)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: Muputi Location (31 villages) solidifies structural engagement with government officers LENS follow-up meeting and meeting of 150 HCT's. Iveti Location (43 villages) reports first quarter actuation includes 29 nursery schools being built, 690 toilets under construction, 1,350 compost pits dug, 1,520 dishracks built and 18,402 trees planted. Twelve of sixteen sub-locations are set up for March impact in Mitaboni and Masii.

Internal: Panchayat team visits Muputi and Iveti Locations. New songs are practised by Kamweleni women to honor the Panchayat, and the completion of two years in the New Village Movement is celebrated by eleven people.

Contradiction: Visiting leaders and villagers to bridge gap of communication, to coordinate increasingly complex village schedule. (Wk. 7)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The IERD planning meeting happens in Lonavala. The Announcement Day on Wednesday is a great event with 150 people present. The meeting produces a set of plans for launching the IERD and assigns a small group to coordinate the preparations out of Brussels.

Internal: The House welcomes an "endless stream" of site visits, volunteers coming and going, and the global guardians and colleagues coming for the IERD planning meeting.

Contradiction: Completing Quarter III and preparing for the next with Area Councils. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Team paints quotes in the cluster circle villages, using words of Tagore. Karodi dam is inspected after four months effort and two government officials visit to ask the team's learning about small industrial development.

Internal: House creates a curriculum for the staff to learn basic English.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum going in spite of national festivals and busy harvesting season. (Wk. 10)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Chikhale cluster hosts a continuing stream of Indian and Overseas visitors as part of the IERD. Two teams begin first stage of 40 *Gram Sabhas* across the Block with a screen to help decide next cluster location. Documentation team completes first round of ten villages. Chikhale village carries out major improvements to the primary school. Two Mahila Mandals collect money and open bank accounts for preschool material.

Internal: House is scattered as teams are assigned to Lonavala IERD meeting, *Gram Sabhas*, Documentation, Cluster actuation and Imaginal Education courses. House sends a large contingent of five *Ashram* people and five villagers to Pune to celebrate the marriage of colleague Vijay Lokhande and Kalpana.

Contradiction: Holding the balance of regional demands and cluster focus. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH**

External: Vaviharsh preschool record check for Zilla Parishad officer. In Kambala, 47 members have taken Rs.2/- shares in the CDA; all members are Adivasi. A contribution of Rs. 5,000/- has been collected for the Marimai community temple. Twenty people have opened saving accounts in Canara Bank, and the goat loan to 20 Adivasi people has been received from Canara Bank.

Internal: House hosts Mico General Manager, Mr. Kroll, on visit to Khambala. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE**

External: Second cycle ends with eight out of ten villages doing visibility *shramadans*. Four drama stages are constructed in cluster, with local funds collected. *Ashram* bulges when 30 public sector people from Taluka District and State drop in for a surprise visit.

Internal: Ashram sends out eight to regional check-signals meeting and Imaginal Education in Budhoda.

Contradiction: Making sure immediate resources and cluster design are focussed on keystones and visibility. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE**

External: Team continues push on Women's Advancement in the cluster with women's meetings in Herliwada, starting their women's society and raising registration funds, and collection of funds in Atigre for the women's society. Chokak women conduct a women's industry survey, Papad market research is done in Warna, and a meeting of the Kolhapur women's cadre. The Block Development Officer promises 20 more bags of cement and future funding is researched in several locations.

Internal: Lounge and gents room is painted, and toys are purchased for E.G. House receives Tom Walker a WCDS volunteer from England, and Eliza and John return from Budhoda.

Contradiction: Getting House women to lead up-front in cluster women's meetings as demonstration for them. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA**

External: NSC camp is held in the cluster village Neroli, with two ICA participants.

Internal: House repairs the collegium room, and the villagers participate in Roundtable. Neware and Wanare are assigned to Chandrapur Imaginal Education course.

Contradiction: Enabling the work in the village to continue while the auxiliary is absent. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM**

External: The bakery reopens with a larger market and new management. The team opens a shop near Gandhi Hospital for selling the bread. Sevagram initiates Maharashtra cluster survey with the whole House participating in the Nandora survey.

Internal: House celebrates completion of a week of priorship training with the birth of the Borker family baby girl.

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI**

External: Imaginal Education course at Thapur High School with 45 teachers is big success and opens up possibilities for further Imaginal Education courses in Bi-metro. 400 cluster people attend "Jish Deshme Ganga Bharat" film at Temburwahi. Two ICA women attend Wanir Basket weaving training. Four bullocks are sanctioned for two Temburwahi farmers and a cluster motor pump survey is completed; ITDP Director, Mr. Wallimbe, and Dr. Dongare, the animal husbandry officer, make site visits. Six new cows arrive from the Dairy society, and orange box contract for Rs. one lakh is won by sawmill employing four more villagers. Six new houses are sanctioned at Sonudi.

Internal: New collegium room decor is put in place, and new food storage cupboard and shelves are added to demonstration kitchen. House hosts four colleagues from Maliwada, Sevagram and Dabhad. Three auxiliaries attend Sardo temple celebration.

Contradiction: Making a realistic practical plan for keystone implementation. (Wk 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD**

External: CYF is held in Yeshwant College. Everyone enjoys themselves very much, and several professors express a desire to work with House more and provide a letter of recommendation.

Internal: Tables, chairs, curtains, tubelight, ceiling cloth and new wall decor as well as distemper transform a bare room into an office.

Contradiction: Failing to involve villagers in planning. (Wk. 10)\*

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: HDZ cluster leaders offer auxiliary housing after two more *Gram Sabhas*. *Ashram* experiments with new time design and builds four-mouth manoeuvre timeline from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m., thus releasing all to participate.

Internal: Sweaters come off and fans go on as winter finally leaves and temperatures soar 15°F in a week.

Contradiction: Keeping up the speed of the Rajdhani Express, while picking up Regional Team along the way. (Wk. 11)\*

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Innovative team of the Area Madras prior, Area Tokyo prior and Bombay Nexus member do a breakopen week in Sri Lanka, securing among other things the Sarvodaya Shramadana chief's, Mr. Ariyaratne's, "yes" to be on the Global Advisory Board, at least one participant for Global Council and the Global Academy, and one solid request for major programme activity with a prestigious rural-based Colombo company for next September. Lady Lindsay's trek allows Bangalore outpost to expand its impact from signal village of Gunjurpalya to the four sectors of Bangalore, enlisting support of the cream of the private sector — with one lakh rupees verbally committed; top businessman, Mr. Sreenivasan, joining the Global Advisory Board; materials and food needs handled; the Archbishop's *carte blanche* approval, and a large Regional Team emerging. Gunjurpalya experiences new role as demonstration village, with four drop-in (unannounced) site visits in one week — the BDO (district officer), the Chief Minister's Secretary, a representative of the Bangalore Development Authority, and the Bombay Area Prior.

Internal: House gathers in one location for first time in three months and for the last time this year to celebrate a year of great victories.

Contradiction: Deciding which of the myriad of possibilities for the next six months will strategically bring off the next four years in Area Madras. (Wk. 11)\*

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Imaginal Education course with 25 primary teachers of leading Calcutta girls' school, La Martiniere, is a great event and paves the way for another course in the twin boys' school next week. LENS is confirmed with Lipton Tea. First proposals for Calcutta bustee programmes are written.

Internal: It is a week of oranges with Paula Philbrook arriving Monday to teach Imaginal Education with one cratefull and Development team, John Burbidge and Monu Bhattacharya, arriving Thursday with another cratefull.

Contradiction: Orchestrating time, troops and money to ensure strategic positioning for Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)\*

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Development arrives for Week II signals check and finds plethora of Kuala Lumpur calls interrupting corporate meetings.

Internal: Collegiums and evenings allow catching up on the quarter's events including the Tonga School, Bombay IERD meeting, Area Sydney, Surabaya LENS and Kuala Lumpur wedge; and House experiences both nexus fast and celebration.

Contradiction: The future is blowing wildly in our faces, sometimes brightening the air and sometimes blinding us. (Wk. 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Letters from Tun Tan Siew Sin, the Chairman of Sime Darby and also a former Malaysia Finance Minister for 15 years, to 14 prominent Malaysians, private sector, ask for their assistance with the ICA development programme and give a short explanation of ICA activity in Malaysia. The Wedge team writes a brief plan for new Malacca project.

Internal: First neighbourhood *gotong royong* (workday) clears the road of big trees that fell in rain storm.

Contradiction: Securing ministerial intervention to assist in obtaining long-term visas. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: A new light shines in discovering the emerging movement as preschool district guild (multi-sector) plans Preschool Fair as part of teachers' style training. 700 colleagues are on mailing list of Vol. I, No. 1, *Sumatera Voice*.

Internal: Management trek with the Hoffs is highlighted by global collegiums and fateful act of finally changing banks.

Contradiction: Insuring clear bookkeeping procedures with the government. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Fees from P.T. Perkebuman 23 LENS bring in \$12,000, and LP 3 ES LENS set for April 12-14 keeps great momentum in two regions of Java's three regions — 79 participants are in the two P.T.P. 23 LENS. National election begins with two-week limited campaigning across the islands, while House pauses to hear Eunice Shankland's report on North American Panchayat trek and the Bombay IERD/July '82 meeting.

Internal: Getting underway again, as Eunice returns after two months and Sherwood returns from his father's funeral, means grounding Area Fast Day with Order economic conversations, sending Elizabeth Neat to Yogyakarta for weekend Global Language School module, and dealing with assignment proposals for Global Academy and July '82 preparation.

Contradiction: Designing troop configuration to initiate new major village work opportunity, while meeting end-of-month administrative deadlines. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Preschool training is held for 35 teachers, including ten new teachers from the two preschools recently started as a result of the Leadership Module. Closing assembly for Leadership Module includes reports on implementation of plans made by participants and the distribution of certificates to participants.

Internal: Stovalls return from Malaysia with new visas, Tajuddin returns from P.T.P. 23 LENS in Surabaya, and Diann McCabe is sent to teach Global Language School in Jogyakarta.

Contradiction: Discerning catalytic activities to sustain the *kecamatan* (sub-district) momentum during the national election. (Wk. 10)\*

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Integrated circuit takes Operations and Research to Japan to attend national meeting and do LENS recruitment. January ICA reports are completed under new national general ledger system. Week is highlighted with development hosting an Evening at the Institute.

Internal: Fasting Day ends with special feast including an assortment of Japanese delicacies presented to the Nexus by Miss Hiroe Takagi before returning to Tokyo after teaching three years in Hong Kong. She comments, "Even before going to my own home in Toyko, I am going to visit the ICA!"

Contradiction: Struggling with the question of how to claim the victory of the year as Quarter IV quickly approaches. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Mau Tin Development negotiations continue with a meeting with the solicitor, which defined more clearly decisions still to be made and work to be done on contract. Village-wide survey, to determine basic needs, important issues and suggestions for use in the future development plan, gets underway. Twelve students from the Chinese University and ICA staff, conduct a total of 36 interviews over the weekend, bringing team to 1/3 of total goal! Foundation president, secretary and member join in too, taking team out for lunch and becoming interviewees with much interest in questioner.

Internal: Robert Yallop is guest at Roundtable to report on Bombay Global Priors meeting on IERD and July '82 preparation under the image of "The Road to '84". The Ballards celebrate their 15th anniversary as a family, with dinner at a French restaurant, from which Louise receives a red rose.

Contradiction: Turning interest into commitment to break-open LENS program in Hong Kong, to allow financial and programmatic victory in Quarter IV. (Wk. 11)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Two teams are sent to Taipei for LENS marketing, Chinese company development, and recruitment for second HDTI in Taiwan.

Internal: House has planning session for next four month's programs and attends one Chinese colleague's wedding.

Contradiction: Having only two Chinese staff to handle all programs and activities. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Trek to Kaohsiung procures US \$2,500 in developed funds and a LENS follow-up consultation with an ICI subsidiary. Initial probe for an HDTI facility turns up 10 leads.

Internal: Peter Hu's daughter gives birth to her third girl, and John Montgomery receives "encouraging news" about an infant boy available for adoption.

Contradiction: Infusing HDTI construct with sufficient historical power and context while allowing the school to be the vehicle through which future program is informed. (Wk. 10)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Site visit to Palawan Island with AMOCO releases \$7,000 for village development. Bernandito Rosalada arrives to participate in development. Auditing firm goes over books in record time. U.S. AID is moving closer to sanctification with the use of affirmative adjectives.

Internal: Efen returns from ITI in Tonga, and Caroline Studholme arrives from U.K. Evenings revolve around long-range brooding. House is impressed by winning entry in International Film Festival "36 Chowringhee Lane", an Indian film.

Contradiction: Responding to multiple programme expansion possibilities while maintaining momentum of corporate thrust. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Three health clinic buildings receive medicines from Regional Health Office. For first time Demonstration Farm in Sudtonggan harvests bitter melon (*Ampalaya*).

Internal: House joins "Feast of Santo Minro" in Cebu, one of year's biggest events. House sends some to new assignments.

Contradiction: Figuring how to move quickly in order to have catalytic group in the midst of having four big arenas with which to work. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

External: First harvest of Magtued Preschool Garden has good peachay squash and cucumber. Doctor Javier visits Langub for skin disease check-up and distributes medicine. Sewing Industry receives order from Gaisano for 200 electric fan covers, and 18 sewing workers put up capital of 100 each to buy more materials. Mountain Cluster Preschool teachers participate in 45th anniversary of Davao. Langub Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting with 42 pesos store gain.

Internal: House has workdays and applies Bagrass fertilizer.

Contradiction: Securing more vegetable seedlings and fruit trees in Bureau of Forest Industry for Demonstration Farm. (Wk. 10)\*

## **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: George Kawai reports to Tokyo advisors on IERD Bombay meeting. Mr. Kaoru Harada, advisor, goes to Sapporo to teach LENS. ICA staff share lessons of teamhood with team leaders and employees of Kawai's company. Michi Hashizume and Izumi Morita are sent out to the U.S.A. for House tour, Global Academy and Global Council.

Internal: Collegiums take a turn towards profundity as House starts to study "Journey to Ixtlan", ex-sojourner Deguchi and Usami report on their Philippines-Sudtonggan trip, and George Kawai spends the night in order to report to sojourners on the IERD.

Contradiction: Looking into the spring quarter programs and seeing hazy fog instead of clear blue sky. (Wk. 11)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Sung Chul and Min Sung attend a week long *Saemaul* (New Village) training course at the National Leaders Training School. CitiBank asks for and receives proposal for interchange program for community workers in Asia.

Internal: The story of Sam Guk Jin, the Three Kingdoms, take on new life even for those who have started it many times in school.

Contradiction: Acting over the end of consensed timeline. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON**

External: Cluster makes economic moves with the two villages sending \$3000 to the Australian Embassy, who will add \$3000 and purchase cattle scales and return a portion for cattle. The Cluster also makes an investment in fruit trees, decides to purchase seeds corporately, and comes for training in raising vegetables. While development money goes into projects, guests — Telford and Hockley and a vice president of Lucky Company — come to talk of more development support.

Internal: House welcomes two young men, Park Seong Kwan and Ahn Cheol Woo, university graduates in civil engineering and agriculture, who plan to sojourn for three months.

Contradiction: Following up planning and training events with coordinated catalytic action. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Roundtable continues to be a fine Saturday night event with half a dozen people remaining until after midnight to talk. Joyce attends the national task force meeting in Tokyo and returns with reports about IERD, July '82 plans, "legalization", and colleague news. Jean visits with National President of Jaycees about meeting in Miyazaki they are sponsoring on the "Future"; she spends two hours briefing him about ICA work and gets an invitation for the House to send observers. While there, she spends the night at the home of the Anglican priest, an old PLC grad. First training session is held for Anglican planning event scheduled for Fukuoka with Rev. Goto, another old PLC grad.

Internal: School holiday gives time for visiting big exposition at local park and getting acquainted with the students from the English classes.

Contradiction: Digesting Region's plans and Area plans out of Tokyo and blending them with Council hopes and concerns for the Order. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Region sends out advisor Mr. Kobori to his new job assignment in Tokyo. Special guests Rev. Fuchigami, a Buddhist priest, and Mark and Seth Reames attend the *Sayonara* Party held in the House. LENS Symposium brochure and cover letter are ready for printing. Regional colleague Rev. Doyama sets up and goes on two-day Awaji circuit.

Internal: Two House staff attend a Japan-style high school graduation at Ashiya High School for a new experience in Japanese ceremony. The sixth monthly cooking class is held with 13 students learning the art of making apple dumplings.

Contradiction: Getting distance on regional accomplishments and ongoing demands while continuing great forward strides. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO**

External: Treks continue almost weekly. Follow-up trek finds Town Meeting participants telling "everyone in town" about the Meeting. LENS visiting finds one new advisor and gets an article published in the *Mainichi* newspaper.

Internal: House works out money for three staff to go to the Philippine work camp, and Roger Butcher gets his picture in the newspaper.

Contradiction: Having fun doing the LENS course through symbolic reflection and celebration. (Wk. 9)

## **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Second week of Darwin GFC involves 70 people in LENS visits, Imaginal Education Lab and GWF resulting in five strong LENS seminars working and two Imaginal Education Labs set for May. A Sydney volunteer agency and the aboriginal community on Bathurst Island schedule LENS follow-up sessions. ESSO calls with increased pledge for \$3,000.

Internal: Series of assignment collegiums are an impacting event for the House. John and Nina Walmsley, colleagues from Newcastle, participate in Research Week II which clarifies priorities for research in the Sydney Region; and Mike and Nan Chapman attend House Church and give report on their trip with the Panchayat Trek through Africa.

Contradiction: Ensuring the regional thrust and momentum is empowered by Area and Nexus presence. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE**

External: Literacy classes begin and catalyze requests for basic education. Department of Aboriginal Affairs visits, led by Regional Director, Kevin Martin. Order for 300 six-inch boom-erangs is confirmed by Murrin Bridge Industries (Woodwork).

Internal: Wayne is sent out to Canberra and Sydney. Charles returns from Brisbane trek with visitor, while Jo catches her first fish ever.

Contradiction: Continually delaying corporate planning due to experience of ring-around-the-rosy — someone is always out on a trek. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: Largest gathering of the year for Dene Rundle's report on India causes reflection for all on Human Development in the Perth Region. \$1,650 in development is in-hand or committed. Health Department LENS is set up. Two colleagues whom we *did not* pitch, ask if they could do LENS with their small businesses (publishing and car dealership).

Internal: Research trek leads to a decision to do a talking paper on "Challenges for Human Development with the White Ur", drawing on team experience in North America, Europe and Australia.

Contradiction: Articulating the implications of Team's unfolding and expanding vision for the Region. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Regional Team welcomes the LENS-Research-Development Trek Team to two and a half full days of collegiums and evenings with turn-outs of 13-18 around the table for reports of IERD and the Globe, workshops and planning and a talking paper. The two daytimes are filled with 12 appointments resulting in two LENS seminars working, one LENS date finalized, and \$600 working.

Internal: Arrival of Frank Powell and Robert Lingerfelter is celebrated with prawn and lamb chop dinner (both gifts) and a big dinner Thursday night hosted by Regional Team member Jane Carmody. Margaret completes first contract of five weeks science teaching in high school.

Contradiction: Integrating results with ongoing strategy while capitalizing on expanded interest and commitment of Regional Team. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Writing of the Regional Proposal to "talking paper" stage has clarified the story as House launches into intensive urban engagement. Two week-day "Luncheons with Liza Tod" catalyze a steady stream of people through the House while visits in Prahran and a meeting in South Melbourne find team out in the targetted geography.

Internal: A great week of visitors including Sue White from Adelaide to Roundtable, and Mark and Fanelle Dove from Cleveland Region, and Eric and Anne Gowers to House Church, and the staff from Murrin Bridge for Week II.

Contradiction: Using the Research Trek screen to push probe visits and to prepare for the trek. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: Circuiters return from 4,000 km trip with one LENS date set; three seriously working and others under consideration. The conversations with Black churchmen give Team encouragement that real change is in the air. Charles Jago appears in Region for Murrin Bridge Industries marketing. West End Community Relations Project holds second meeting.

Internal: House experiences "Showers of Blessings" as sojourner Sheila Dipple moves in, bringing great formation possibilities as well as added spirit. Self-support gets boost with three more part-time jobs.

Contradiction: Building Regional Team consensus on quarterly planning. (Wk. 11)\*

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA**

External: On Shell LENS call Fiji Operations Manager recognizes the new Qantas employee T-shirts as a direct result of the Qantas LENS. Foketi Fuimaono begins Week I ICA training programme with report of Salani Preschool renovation plan enabled by strong village council support. Samoan PTS grads meet and plan for Quarter IV. Burns Philp LENS is off to a great start as three departments ask for follow-up consultation after only two sessions.

Internal: Child care staff arrival is cause for great sign of relief, and the telephone is working again after a one week disorder.

Contradiction: Reconstructing this year's self-support plan. (Wk. 10)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AGANA**

External: One-day Kwajalein trip enables cash flow victory. Marshall Islands unilaterally declares itself a "Republic" on March 12th, and first Chief Justice of the M.I. High Court is inducted. Jaime concludes Guam trek with authorization victories.

Internal: House welcomes Art Smith with his marketing prowess and Barbara Hawley for annual TASC audit as fiscal year ends March 31.

Contradiction: Enabling the regular functioning of the local Board as the support base for TASC. (Wk. 12)\*

**SAN FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Documentation work continues in Sanger completing four months of implementation after community LENS. Formation of Health and Education Guild research continues with appointments in the Bay Area. Watsonville LENS spurs new programmatic activity.

Internal: New sense of collegiality emerges as Regional Team participates in Roundtable, House Church, breakfast collegium and daily appointments.

Contradiction: Holding the balance of reflection and different internal time design while seeing the necessity of setting program before summer. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Eruption of Mt. St. Helen's signals beginning of "Northwest Regional Rendezvous" on Friday evening as Lockmans present slide show on their recent trip to Conacoste and Haiti. Panchayat talks with 38 of Regional Team about REP learnings. Pacific Rim Celebration is breakloose of decor, music, foods, dress and readings from countries of the Pacific Rim.

Internal: Bill Fenton and Susan Mahalik (plus cat) arrive for sojourn as space is rearranged to accommodate largest meeting ever held in the House.

Contradiction: Having the patience to honor all the new decisions of the larger team in midst of anxiousness over specific missional requirements. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: Upcoming CS-I, RS-I and Imaginal Education courses push production of new course brochures while marketing the RS-I to six churches. Facility is confirmed for Symposium II as mid-plan redirection allows brochure pull together, undergirding supplied by 14 Foundation proposals sent out and \$1,000 check from one family.

Internal: New colleague Dom Canavario returns from Health Guardians PSU in Chicago to join Jim Hamje sojourning at the House.

Contradiction: Equipping the circuit teams to do the whole mission, not just immediate bottom lines. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: Whole Region listens expectantly as Augustine Hajega circuits New Mexico and west Texas giving new possibilities to Albuquerque, Santa Rosa, Portales and El Paso colleagues. House does first workshop with *Ojos de la Comunidad* (eyes of the community). Colleague wills \$23,000 to ICA.

Internal: Global Fast helps focus team collegiality and regional task.

Contradiction: Creating the missional structures of Region-wide follow through on the catalytic program situations. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PISINEMO**

External: New farm field is initiated with planting of the Santa Cruz Demonstration Farm specialty crop, Papago or Tepary beans.

Internal: The Andersons, retired farm couple from Minnesota, show their Holy Land slides to local Bible study class and prepare for departure after five months as volunteers in Pisinemo.

Contradiction: Preparing the transition to new district office without definite designation of space for the different organizational units of the community. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Three Office of Energy Conservation Forums in two metros net new friends, programs and \$1,057. Alamosa four-sector leaders meeting opens up programs. Global Academy recruitment continues. House attends Hemisphere '82 Conference.

Internal: House prepares for Panchayat visit, Native American Evening with the Institute and RS-I course.

Contradiction: Giving more concrete form to the covenant of the Regional Team. (Wk. 12)\*

**EDMONTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: New participants and colleagues are excited by excursion reports and impressed with the methods at the Assembly of "The Prairie Potential: Pioneering Saskatchewan's Future" as they enthusiastically work on the directions of the Mandates as consensed on at the Symposium. Six teams visit 544 persons during the excursions. Development arrives in Edmonton soon after the staff arrive from Saskatchewan, while three House staff go to Manitoba for preparation of that Regional Consult.

External: Wayne Ellsworth visits to firm up Eaton's LENS and do intensive week of marketing with 16 calls held. Americas Challenge and this week's calls birth need to do demonstration LENS process with initial response creating need to hold two seminars of 20 participants each. Call with B.C. Research discovers a collegial institution that wants to talk more about collaborative work and the possibility of using their network to market ICA programs.

Internal: Regional Team symbolizes transition to new priorship with professional framing of decor, passing on of financial systems, sending 1981 audit materials to Montreal, and holding grand send-out celebration for the Oberg's of Chinese food served Japanese style.

Contradiction: Creating catalytic atmosphere around the programmatic thrust that increases momentum already established. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG**

External: Programs conceived during Americas Challenge come full term as staff facilitates Casa de Amigas Community Center Youth Forum (with four youth staff from Houston House); holds Imaginal Education Course with all participants having been contacted during the Maneuver; does Town Meeting set-up meetings in Kendleton, Texas; holds Houston Apartment Association workshop on effective Human Relations for Apartment Managers; and launches CS-I Pedagogy weeknight series. Interchange happens as Don Cramer travels to join staff of programs in Baton Rouge, Atlanta and Richmond, Virginia. Metro Team colleagues and weekend sojourner empower Update mailing and February Meeting.

Internal: Blue mashed potatoes, multi-colored corn and green milk served up by youth in surprise menu for Fat Tuesday set stage for observance of Ash Wednesday.

Contradiction: Managing overloaded support systems (characterized by chronic car troubles) which threaten programmatic "brown-out". (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: Dallas Regional meeting in Oklahoma City is occasioned by the Panchayat visit with Justin Morrill and Maureen Jenkins. House used the rest of the weekend for regional experiment reflection, planning for the next quarter. Key learning was in the arena of consensus forming or "spreading the goo", termite style.

Internal: House has a creative imaginal celebration at the Whitsetts watching R-rated *12 Plus 1* on cable TV.

Contradiction: Expanding shareholders of Methods, Inc. financially and programmatically. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Collegium on Missional Focus zeroes in on LENS Weekend for regional colleagues, which will simultaneously be demonstration, pedagogy and planning for the Region.

Internal: Conversations about Shizuyo's participation in the Global Academy, Youth Cluster finances, securing of additional employment, and planting a garden create the foundations for Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Implementing decisions to focus energies and start missional programme. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Current documentary on El Salvador climaxes Roundtable at Ferritor's in Banton Rouge. Patron Nan Kirby delights 22 guests with her Indian cooking and slides of Indian Village Development, while the Baemers use the global film to similarly impact their guests in New Orleans. Development team returns from Tulane Women's event and other visits bubbling over with program possibilities and requests.

Internal: Fast is signficated by exposure to others who are feasting or starving.

Contradiction: Unlocking people and funds to capture present regional possibility and release new future while catalyzing excited youth participation for the Long March. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Appointment with Mrs. Jean (Andrew) Young, Black Engagement Strategy core team meeting, preparation for McDonald's Store Managers eight-week PMA course and continued set-up contact for North Fulton High School PSU and Richmond County Rural Communities Consultation, all reveal that though one may be in tune with the global needs, the impact of care hits hard at the local. The team holds this understanding with the quote of the week's work, "I had not seen before now the "bag" people of the streets."

Internal: Michi Hashizume and Izumi Morita intensify week of the turnstile Wayside Inn as Tippett family host daughters, Meg and Kit, while Tomeka Williams visits family for Spring break and celebration of her 11th birthday in fine mixture of Japanese and American traditions.

Contradiction: Building sustaining framework upon which to hang the demands of internal and external care. (Wk. 11)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Regional Team participates in Cultural Studies Seminar at House in Orlando. Jo Ann Houpt shares report of Panchayat trek to Africa. Development trek opens up new orbits in Vero Beach, Orlando Metro.

Internal: Lin Wisman from Development Centrum and Don Cramer, Houston Area prior, enable development trek and Cultural Studies.

Contradiction: Figuring out the way to row with a skeleton crew barely on board. (Wk. 12)\*

**CHICAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: The 35th Global Academy begins with 88 around the table, all four phases are represented. Development receives the Eaton LENS fee of \$6,000, a colleague's gift of \$8,000 and an anonymous farmer's gift of \$7,000. Confirmation comes that Robert McNamara is on the IERD Global Advisory Board.

Internal: Report by Nancy Grow of her university work defining the cruciality of rituals and pulling together the Order's and Institute's learnings on rituals caps a week highlighted by a progressive dinner to celebrate the end of Quarter III.

Contradiction: Operating out of fragmented multi-images of Quarter IV, as when looking into a kaleidoscope the wrong way. (Wk. 13)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO**

External: Chicago House premieres the Family Lab, a four-session event that allows families to rearticulate their life-long and current mission. At a reformulation Board Meeting, those responsible for care of the community center clarify the rental policy. Terry Bergdall and Mariam Quereshi make several successful development calls.

Internal: Sojourner, Sara Lalja, arrives Wednesday, stays four days engaging thoroughly, and then leaves for Mexico.

Contradiction: Designing county-wide programs which have comprehensive framing and training built into the constructs so that House can serve partnerships over a sustained period of time. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Self-support foray to Monticello II National Bank for three-session consultation produces workable format for corporate mission statement and request for proposal to come do rest of process. House is on road as Ruby does development in Lincoln, Jan and Madan do LENS in West Virginia and Wests do self-support pilot in Illinois.

Internal: Wests celebrate their 8th anniversary in the Champaign/Urbana Ramada as guests of bank (during consultation) with dinner and bottle of champagne from C/U Metro, courtesy of Audry Ayres.

Contradiction: Reconfiguring to win on commitments of program and development. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

External: A series of 10 one-day operational planning events are being held with physical research scientists at Honeywell resulting in new effective planning methodologies. Practical team leadership training begins with clerical Quality Circles groups at IDS Life Insurance Company. Student Leadership course staff hold a 90-Day Strategy PSU to position for next year in light of severe budget and staff cuts in St. Paul Public Schools.

Internal: Collegium on the ICA, OE organizational dynamic of corporate process is held for new staff and interns, resulting in new images for all of House on polity structure.

Contradiction: Implementing Regional Team working sessions within winning, heavy program demands. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

External: Planning PSU with student leadership of suburban high school, with District Superintendent sitting in, is a key event that opens the door of the district to ICA. House participates in LENS facilitator training in Chicago, and first Update of 1982 is mailed. Wellston School District and the Day Care Department of St. Louis Housing Authority asks House to do teacher training.

Internal: Intense Week II activity leaves a vacant house as Addingtons go to Chicago and both youth go to work. *The World Challenge* study with metro colleagues continues to electrify all.

Contradiction: Tying down three scheduled programs while establishing crowded Black Engagement team schedule, which will break open new relationships. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

External: Two sets of program letters are in the mail as the result of new computer training and system. Tri-County LENS in Upper Peninsula ends with participants excited about implementaries and three people committed to the Guardians Meeting.

Internal: Regional Team decides to move Week 13 by delineating space and time in the midst of answering want ad responses and packing six "Fibber McGee" closets.

Contradiction: Orchestrating House move to training center as a dance — and not as a "keystone Kops" routine. (Wk. 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Shaker Heights, Ohio parent group, teachers and administrators participate in Imaginal Education course and experience re-empowered resolve and vocation and dedication to work consistently together on resolving and enjoining community education issues.

Internal: The House and metro Imaginal Education training session draws line of large group of old colleagues to dinner and reflection on the context of the course and beyond task force.

Contradiction: Tailoring appropriate follow-up after each event and integrating residue with existing proto-type activities. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

External: Imaginal Education course in Cincinnati bridges three metros, including eleven new people plus many old hands, effectively pushes on Black Engagement Strategy, and breaks loose some new insights on future form of the course.

Internal: Peter Apinyah of Ghana moves into House for four-month sojourn before returning to West Africa.

Contradiction: Weaving together a variety of care structures in such a way that the whole team is enabled and sustained. (Wk. 12)\*

### **NEW YORK**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: First Regional Team manual is ready for distribution. Regional Team creates systems for "March to 4th Street" maneuver. First meeting with representatives of 4th Street Block Association produces invitation to join and desire for training.

Internal: Collegium on gaining university degree by documenting Institute experience reveals exciting replicable model.

Contradiction: Creating the systems which will intensify the momentum and coordinated effort directed toward the new training center. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Representatives of five nations and three major world religions gather for an Evening with the Institute at the residence of Anthony and Hilde Betonte in Morgantown, West Virginia. Area Guardians Trek brings to consciousness the Guardian role as Joan Seacord of New York meets Dan and Jane Moore of Huntington, West Virginia. Shrove Tuesday pancake Roundtable impacts lyricist of "We are in a New World Now" with the emerging paradigm.

Internal: Pittsburgh permeators top \$50,000 in self-support income.

Contradiction: Objectifying missional reality to allow structural care for the entire Region. (Wk. 8)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Ellen Howie returns from Charleston, West Virginia, with exciting report on Community LENS in housing projects. Visit with Institute on Man and Science for serious conversation on Project Documentation. Team distributes 500 brochures for Imaginal Methods workshops — six paid registrations are received.

Internal: Panchayat visit is occasion for colleague gathering, including a Troy physician, George Saxton, who once considered volunteering for 5th City Health Outpost when he taught in Chicago.

Contradiction: Tracking people as well as programs. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: Marguerite Nock CS-III graduate and Black Engagement Strategy follow-up participant visits House to discuss possibility of attending HD-I course. In-depth conversation with Allen Poole, Director of City Ventures, reveals comprehensive plans for Industrial Park and extensive revitalization for Parkside area of west Philadelphia. Prior attends Coordinating Council for Human Services that serves eastern section of North Philadelphia where colleague Shirley Smith gives pitch for HD-I.

Internal: House welcomes Ermetra Black upon her return to sojourn after attending Quarter II Global Academy and spending time in Chicago with her family.

Contradiction: Creating for the Regional Team an image that recruiting HD-I is doing formation. (Wk. 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.**

External: Formation Colloquy research teams visit Southern Virginia and Eastern Shore polises — one team does interviews in Black Barber Shop of small town. Mailing of interview forms and community data sheets goes out to 500 people across the Region. Empowerment team continues set-up of Sir James Lindsay-IERD trek appointments and dinners.

Internal: Three signal collegiums on Petersburg, Virginia, ad hoc committee meeting; Computer Paradigm business venture and India IERD planning meeting provide exciting brooding images.

Contradiction: Discerning Team's commitment deadlines and Team's resources of commitment relative to a major city-wide consult in Petersburg, Virginia. (Wk. 10)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Week of development makes numerous contacts with religious orders opening new channels for support for global program and Starks Enterprise Corporation. Kelly Michael decides to attend the Global Academy in April-May. David Morton and Wendy Rose head for West Virginia for ten days of Community LENS programs.

Internal: House sends representative to Area workday on New York facility, hosts Development team and variety of other visitors. Spring begins to show.

Contradiction: Facing squarely operational limits (i.e. one Day One troop) in order to uncover healthier modes of planning and action for the future. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS**

External: Starks Enterprise Corporation President Peter Cook joins House in traveling to New York for workday on Lower Eastside facility. Frank Russell, S.E.C. Secretary, joins Wendy in visiting CBO's (Community Based Organizations) in Oxford County in preparation for Maine Community Development Project Conference. Jim does foray, uncovering three possible Woodworks orders; Judy visits religious orders for Cornshop funding; Tim conducts nine forums to date with 140 people (35% of total Mic Mac population) and sets up conference for recognition at Harvard Law School.

Internal: Wendy is sent out to West Virginia to help with Community LENS leadership; typing proceeds on big "self-support" paper; and discussions are held in Boston on vision for Order future.

Contradiction: Getting minds wire together in preparation for major site visits this week. (Wk. 11)\*

External: Visit to India Week film event opens new network and finds possible sojourner. Second community room opens at (*Habitations*) Jeanne-Mance. A 50-name press release list is acquired for the city's broadcasters and newspaper publishers.

Internal: Last room in House is painted as Spring arrives and Kristen increases self-support work.

Contradiction: Using advantages with the city in order to go beyond them. (Wk. 11)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: In anticipation of visit by Sir James Lindsay, meetings are held with former Governor General of Canada, Roland Michener, and Senator Richard Stanbury, Canada-India Business Council Chairman, under whose auspices a luncheon is planned with key leading members of the business community. Preparations for up-coming CYF continue with student leadership training of Applewood Secondary School students. Methods presentation is requested by Alexander
