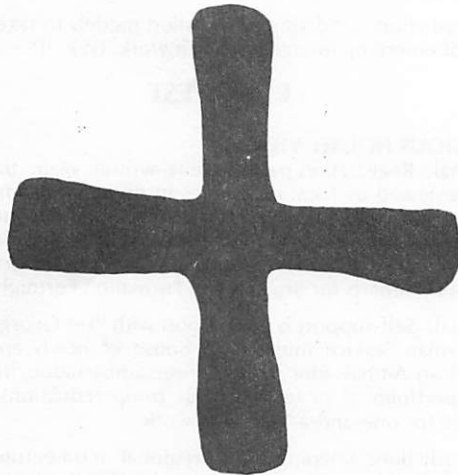

QUARTER IV WEEK FIVE

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: *Caja de Ahorros* (Spain's largest network of savings and loan associations) says "yes" to a demonstration LENS for regional directors of social work; and several professional entertainers say "yes" to performing at Boceguillas fiesta to initiate their new village association and cultural centre. Signs are now visible in Nacomba after school activities, Ferreiros Health Center, Cambres Adult Education classes, Varzea Social Center, Penude new road, Monteiras Health Fair with 200 people and Granjo Do Te Do fruit-processing industry. Development trek to Porto nets 6 yeses from wine companies, and President of Lamego Camara visits first of five villages in Lamego *Concelho*.

Internal: International company asks Pat Allen to return as English teacher at \$500 per month for 3 hours a day, significantly improving self-support outlook.

Contradiction: Implementing Consult systems for Lamego and all systems for April-May LENS blitz in midst of finalizing positive decisions from "fence-sitters". (Wk. 13)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: House is informed on Thursday that a LENS is scheduled on Monday with a subsidiary of Masey Furgeson — and scrambles to cover all battle stations for LENS in midst of facility manoeuvres.

Internal: Danny O'Neill is sent out for special assignment to do some brooding on his plans for his life, and Ryan Gilbert returns from week of visiting Glasgow House.

Contradiction: Lacking a model which will allow the move to be an effective short engagement rather than a protracted campaign. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: As part of Glasgow framing development, visits are made to two key contacts, given by YMCA colleague, the Director of Strathclyde Regional Council Department of Social Work and the Head of Glasgow Council on Voluntary Services.

Internal: House is sent out for two weeks with celebrative feast around Meditation exercises, the film *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and then a symbolic Maundy Thursday breakfast as individuals go to Cardiff, Brussels and Newcastle for discontinuity and the Formation Fortnight.

Contradiction: Firming up position for next year without losing hold of priorities or making ungrounded promises. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: House participation in Council of Churches meeting initiates leadership scheme for Ecumenical House groups in district.

Internal: Mary and Felicia attend South Wales Play Conference and re-establish permeation possibilities in community work.

Contradiction: Weaving regional programme with area task force. (Wk. 4)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Four from House and three others from France take part in Formation Fortnight. Ethical Response course is reported to have "good spirit for our time". Two from Regional Team write the newsletter.

Internal: Arrival of Margaret Braun from Toronto and Cathy Bishop from Sydney, and hearing a report from Yugoslavian youth movement and a lecture on Teilhard de Chardin all enrich House.

Contradiction: Working out of a long vision when springtime tempts fragmented exploration. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Continental Women's Course is launched with 25 present from Glasgow, London, Bristol/Cardiff, Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, and Frankfurt with Brussels women's study group and House as faculty, resulting in the demonstration of new methods of researching the Revolutions and the emergence of a self-conscious network of care. Whole House participates in four-day BF 60,000 consultation in Brugge to train Indonesian Government Officials in methods of regional catalysis. The *Third Wave* study completes sixth session with all day forum and celebration.

Internal: House concentrates on recovery of humanness as a team with weekly "going sane" evening studying Dr. Jean Baker Miller's book, *Toward A New Psychology of Women*, and celebrates Rose Casswell's 28th birthday (cinema and restaurant) as foursome—first time House goes out together.

Contradiction: Discovering that, with an absolute explosion of mission and implosion of spirit, indicies of sociological accountability for mission have disappeared and now need to be discovered for Quarter IV planning. (Wk. 12)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Six people from the Region attend Formation Fortnight in Brussels, including three from Ludwigshafen core. Bishop of Lamego spends the night at the House en route from appointment with Miserior, Catholic funding agency, and House prepares a real Bishop's room.

Internal: Yvonne goes to IERD meeting in London and Katherine goes to staff LENS on the St. Josse community and for the Fortnight. New job schedule is irregular, but flexible, giving needed Day I time.

Contradiction: Capturing and releasing this year's victory and the necessary historical residue critical for future of the Movement in Germany together with implementing survival tactics in the financial arena. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Visit by Paige Cousineau enables House to contact seven agencies that care for needs of women and society, and her visit creates openings for collaboration on a number of vistas. Planning workshop is held with colleague to begin count-down toward Imaginal Methods course in week 7. Four potential volunteers contact House, and two come by for four-hour orientation session.

Internal: House gears up for another round of being dispersed with a short check-signals meeting after Roger returns from permeation trip to Somalia. Kate is sent out to the Fortnight in Brussels.

Contradiction: Creating the consensus that supports the Region, while in a state of radical dispersion. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**ROME****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: Several calls are made on several *Collegio* to recruit for seminar sponsored by Caritas Italian. Presentation at Santa Sussana Women's Guild opens contacts for future engagement. Mr. and Mrs. Clark of FAO attend guest night.

Internal: House spends three days doing Quarter IV planning and equips the training centre with newly purchased crockery and tables built by House.

Contradiction: Getting task done in half the time before Easter holidays begin. (Wk. 13)

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Development in Stockholm opens new possibilities for public sector funding. The Danish *Sundhedsstyrelsen* approves upgrading of medical job because of ability to use the local language and also because the ICA "appears to be humanitarian in its nature." Hansen family holds a celebrative evening for 17 guests.

Internal: Following disappearance of the last of the snow and receiving contributions of plants and vegetable seedlings, the House and garden are transformed with new colour.

Contradiction: Updating formulation models to take advantage of emerging interest in urban work. (Wk. 3)*

BUDAPEST**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Registration papers are re-written again, translated and reviewed by local colleagues in preparation for official registration in Austria. Key referral invites House to lunch (in a border town peering into Czechoslovakia) with promises to open up more doors for House in Austrian public sector. Half of House departs for Brussels and Formation Fortnight event.

Internal: Self-support is given boost with "Let George Do It" Handyman Service initiated in house of newly appointed American Ambassador (one of three ambassadors in Vienna with portfolio of negotiations for troop reduction) netting \$110.00 for one-and-a-half day's work.

Contradiction: Keeping local regional momentum going when half of House keeps disappearing over horizon. (Wk. 1)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA**

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

ABIDJAN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Training program continues as Regional Team moves to cluster site for expanded training in village meeting methods in preparation for launching new clusters. Nelson goes to Ghana to do series of village meetings.

Internal: Jean-Claude Kouadio is received as an intern — the first Ivorian intern.

Contradiction: Training new people fast enough to keep up with missional thrust. (Wk. 12)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Ijeda Management Committee resolves its own cash flow crisis. Appointment with Federal Agriculture and Co-operative Directors shows support for cooperative training programme. Community Health Forum has 57 participants from Araromi village in Badagry L.G.A.

Internal: Quarter IV planning is celebrated with Easter House Church and day at Badagry Beach. Elina Olatunji receives Nigerian resident visa.

Contradiction: Organizing selves missionally for new quarter. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: On multiple site visit at the same time, Zambia Airways, U.S. Embassy and *National Mirror* newspaper are impacted by preschool programme in Diamond of Zambia and high visibility of Kapini. Air India completes Regional Training Centre wall symbols; Lions Club visits Kapini to announce 1000-patient health camp for D.O.Z.; and District Headquarters extends mobile health facility. Lyn Mathews, Marian Bassham and the Parekhs symbolically touch Zimbabwe soil in Area Johannesburg. Board holds monthly meeting at House; and Bleadon-Castro team is sent out after six-month sojourn.

Internal: House studies Sphere South and comes up with symbol for Area Kinshasa during Roundtable. House hosts Mavis L. Muyunda, M.P. and U.S. Embassy representatives at a dinner in Kapini HDP.

Contradiction: Building a practical plan that includes new troop configuration to ensure immediate funding, preschool initiation, village industries, and long-range programme support. (Wk. 11)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Four-sector pot begins to boil as 103 village leaders from two locations surrounding Kamweleni sign up to be assigned to consult, circuits and Village Leader's Institutes. Ford Foundation calls to finalize process of large village movement grant after positive evaluation of the last grant. African Assembly of Local Development proceeds with brochure ready for printing.

Internal: In a week of getting our act together, each post writes manoeuvres for the quarter and several people hit the road.

Contradiction: Weaving tangible accomplishments relative to the AALD into all post priorities. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Location Consult set-up proceeds smoothly as over 2500 villagers attend sub-location meeting to select representatives to attend Location Consult. Gathama-Gatira-Ngamburi villages produce 70 people to complete two-year timeline as part of Muthithi Sub-location planning.

Internal: House prepares for Location Consult and District Commissioner's visit by cleaning and redecoring House including the creation of seven sub-location tracking charts which cover one whole wall.

Contradiction: Having undeveloped communication structures and programme realization modes to care for both villages and circuiters. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: 116 village leaders attend Village Leaders Conference signing up for village circuits, VLI and consult experience in other villages from their own area. U.S. AID Nairobi representatives visit Kamweleni HDP and Muputi Cluster with suggestions for funding proposals. Kamweleni House completes first circuit to Masii and Mitaromi Locations since the impact with great implementations begun.

Internal: House sends out project director A. Mwamose to go and teach Village Development Meeting to the Kamweleni Human Development Training Institute as a support force for only one day.

Contradiction: Scheduling meetings with government timeline in mind while getting clear on new two-day circuit model to each village and coordinating C.C.F. input scheme in Muputi. (Wk. 3)*

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: A tri-centrum onslaught on Bangalore pushes HDTI down the road. Treks cover whole spectrum of missional activity across the continent.

Internal: House is impacted by collegiums, one that pulls together *The World Challenge* study and another that looks at project selection for the Global Exposition. Pilot Ethical Studies course confronts House with the challenge of 21st Century global care.

Contradiction: Finding the spirit mode and time-marking that will make the whole mission resonate with Being. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: V.L.C. meeting, Commissioner's visit, and Cluster Leaders meeting (four out of nine villages) in sixth month provide opportunities to intensify participatory planning. Frame is strengthened with call to new commissioner (number one man for the division) regarding change in Maliwada Panchayat.

Internal: White washing in Ashram gives everyone a lift about the space.

Contradiction: Strengthening ICA authorization to break through past images. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Team completes Block level *Gram Sabha* campaign of 40 *Gram Sabhas*, and the two teams write up evaluative report for Block Development Officer. Large wall map of the Panval Block is finished and hung in collegium room; *Gram Sabha* villages and present grid of Chikhale Cluster are marked on the map. House holds a cluster preschool teachers meeting including representatives from three preschools outside the Cluster. *Ambar Charkha* unit sends production worth Rs. 26,000 to Gujarat buyer. Team hosts the Maharaja of Jodpur on a Chikhale site visit.

Internal: After sending out Ramesh Jadhav, Prabharti Bhalerao and Jerdalsingh Dumale to new House assignments, House hosts a Research Centrum team for two days as part of documentation training for the staff. Fast has deep impact, and two collegiums on *Gram Sabha* learnings and Quarter III village accomplishments are great happenings.

Contradiction: Being open to requests for follow-up to *Gram Sabhas* as part of continuing block research without pulling the plug on momentum of first cluster actuation. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

External: Government engineer visits Khambale to take measurements for the preschool and signs a certificate for the release of 50 bags of cement.

Internal: Team gets loan from Canara Bank for 20 sheep for Khambala.

Contradiction: Finding a teacher for the preschool. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE

External: Four cluster farmers meet with Dr. Sapare of Kirloskar Consultants and Canara Bank; and the farmers decide to go ahead with the Wadgar Lift Irrigation Scheme; nearly all local money is in hand. Zagalwadi collects local money for painting; Wadgoan collects money for TV application, and Lohom Youth *Mandal* type registration application. Women's team visits 26 women in preparation for Women's Industry and are surprised in one village to discover that the women have already been saving and want to register their *Mahile Mandal*.

Internal: *Ashram* is like S.T. Bus, sending colleagues George Knott to Budhoda and Sherod Raut to Vaviharsh and receiving Prabha Bhalariao and Ramesh Jadhav from Chikhale. *Ashram* experiences the grounding of the song, "Jagruti" with the presence of more women in the *Ashram*. Surprise collegium on ten largest nations of the world gives many new images and reminder of both the gap and the demand to be one globe.

Contradiction: The need to create new images and use methods that enable village people to see that they have everything necessary to take care of the village. (Wk. 1)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE

External: Nalla Bunding meeting and site survey are held in Maale and Maslewade, recognizing that the shortage of cement may slow down the scheme and interrupt several quarter projects. Loan surveys are conducted in three villages; some schemes, where loans are readily available, will get quickly underway. In Kalondi, a women's meeting is held and funds are collected for a future society. Maale celebrates Dr. Ambedkar Jayanthi's birthday and earlier in the week has a feast.

Internal: Karune Khamble successfully makes her first witness. Long awaited table arrives, and more survey forms are printed and they are disappearing at an alarming rate.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move on the loan survey as the basis for economic development. (Wk. 1)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA

External: Team collects Rs. 175 for the *Ambar Charkha* shed, attends a Rotary meeting and constructs a urinal. Team visits guardians, sets date for global film show and does a *shramdan* for the Shivaji statue unveiling. The drinking water tank is fixed and the B.D.O. visits.

Internal: House does quarter planning and a training session on Circle Cluster preparation. John McAdam works with *Ashram* three days, and George Knott is assigned for three months.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move into the cluster with few troops and little money. (Wk. 1)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM

External: The bakery reopens with a larger market and new management. The team opens a shop near Gandhi Hospital for selling the bread. Sevagram initiates Maharashtra cluster survey with whole House participating in Nandora survey.

Internal: House celebrates completion of a week of priorship training with the birth of the Borker family baby girl.

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI

External: Ambedkar statue plan estimate is complete; Rs. 93 is raised by Kochi villagers in Navagaon and Bakhadi, and villagers donate bullock carts to bring 80 stones for statue base. Berdi proposals for ITDP and cement quota are signed by *Sarpanch*. Team members are meal guests at colleagues Moses Davids, Thapar H.S. Principal Gaur and Public Works Department Executive Engineer Rathi. Mr. Rathi inkind 400 roof tiles for Tembhurwahi preschool, and Chanda guardian Vijay Tambekar inkind the use of two trucks from PWD to bring inkind preschool bricks. Tembhurwahi GWF story (35 Cluster women and 15 from nearby cities) is told at four village women's meetings and appears in the *Ballarpur Times*. No objection letter for Gandhi statue site is signed and money collection begins. Tembhurwahi hosts 200 cluster villagers at *Bhajan* and dance programme.

Internal: Area Council report gives new images. Wisdom is given and gained in four collegiums dealing with social programme learnings, four sector qualities, Quarter IV bi-metro calendar, and Global Women.

Contradiction: Creating three-month actuation timeline that will give ten villages and the ICA staff clear vision and inform budget priorities. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD

External: Villagers accompany ICA staff to see silk-worm farm in operation. Two villagers submit applications for silk-worm farm training to District Industry Commission.

Internal: Dabhad *Ashram* becomes battleground for children from village and ICA staff while celebrating *Holi* festival with coloured water.

Contradiction: Missing the week's depth planning brings few victories. (Wk. 11)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: First *shramdans* take place in HDZ cluster villages (whitewashing). Mr. Dethé calls in from Chandigarh to report good progress in the state authorization work he is doing for the HDZ. Mr. Dethé spins stories about this region's history and gives the HDZ a new perspective. The BATA Company donates furniture for cluster outpost and shoes for auxiliary (including E.G.).

Internal: Mary D'Souza's collegium on the Maharashtra Block Experiment informs House about cluster breakthroughs and struggles. Prabhakar Gurav arrives from Bombay Nexus to boost area team, and Wendy Saegenschnitter's sister drops in while on six-month global tour.

Contradiction: Moving ahead on what is sensed to be winning strategy in the midst of many uncertainties about implementation capacity. (Wk. 3)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Village meeting with two government officials, five bank executives, six executives from a fertilizer company and 90 villagers from Gunjurpalya is highlighted by spontaneous witnesses to ICA's effectiveness in awakening villagers to their own possibilities. Two Sikh villagers sign up for HDTI. Over 60 participants are committed for HDTI, and Rs. 12,000 of inkind is being collected. First contact with a Bangalore company results in immediate gift of Rs. 5000.

Internal: Australia, America, Malaysia, England, Germany, and the states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh are all represented on eight-person HDTI set-up team.

Contradiction: Maintaining vigilance on every front for HDTI set-up when numerous "yesses" tend to lull House into a false sense of security. (Wk. 3)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: First paid registration is in hand, and Rama Krishna Mission facility is confirmed for Methods Academy. LENS seminars are set with General Electric and Lipton. Imaginal Education with St. Augustine Day School results in two participants for the Methods Academy.

Internal: Collegium reviews quarter manoeuvres. James Latrobe returns to Dhabad after Imaginal Education course.

Contradiction: Discovering the tactics to ensure the year's signal event of the Methods Academy. (Wk. 3)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Joint Nexus fincom sessions initiate campaign towards ending the year in the black, which is followed up in the regions by mailing and Nexus presence.

Internal: Nexus hosts the Kuala Lumpur Regional House at House Church on Easter Day, and House invites neighbours' children to join the E.G. in egg-hunting on Easter.

Contradiction: Continuing to struggle with continent-wide campaign that enables the diversity of SEAPAC to join in one thrust. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Election count-down rivets attention of the nation on campaign, while the House hosts Research and Management Treks. Development maneuvers continue to be a major focus — M\$2,000 is received from QBE this week.

Internal: Traditional Easter is celebrated with a fine breakfast feast at Kuala Lumpur Nexus. First Malaysian sojourner of the year comes for a four-day "look-see".

Contradiction: Establishing firm dates for Quarter IV programmes quickly so that key events do not slide into Quarter I or II. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: House has week of program marketing blitz and being blitzed as 23 calls are made resulting in leadership training modules working, inkind victories and plantation companies visiting House for program information. Sub-District Tanjung Pura Preschool Fair momentum builds with visit to Education Director, TV and with joint sponsorship letter. First Roundtable in series on *The Third Wave* and *The World Challenge* has three regional colleagues present.

Internal: House welcomes Ann Epps for regional development and marketing trek which has whole House building proposals and budgets.

Contradiction: Making sure transportation does not block 653 preschoolers from being the stars of the "Preschool Symphony Fair". (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Indonesia Chamber of Commerce Secretary General proposes LENS as part of Chamber training program with Dutch businessmen grant. Team met with Mrs. Abidin, Treasurer ICA: Indonesia and her consultant to set up ICAI financial systems.

Internal: House celebrates Easter with first House Church in three years and Easter egg hunt for the emerging generation and sends out Doug Rettig to the Global Academy with gifts from the East. Quarter IV planning places emphasis on HDZ program webbing along with ICAI systems, long-range permeation, Regional Team action and cash in the bag.

Contradiction: Building necessary revolutionary systems that will enable global and national ICA operations. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: A revised plan of operations for ICA Ujung Pandang for 1982-83 is written in one day, complete with revised budget. Bappeda LENS follow-up visit begins plan for agency LENS presentation.

Internal: Terry McCabe is sent to Jakarta for three weeks of framing. Ping-pong fever hits children, youth and staff in Bontoa.

Contradiction: Clarifying the quarter's thrust to use time effectively. (Wk. 2)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Seoul Management trek refines the national General Ledgers. Seoul Development victory of US \$19,000 achieves bottom line. US \$300,000 ADAB for Davao Region expansion is submitted. Jim Bell is sent to Sapporo and to Global Academy Transposition.

Internal: Conversations around Bold Moves produces depth reflection and concerned response.

Contradiction: Maintaining financial undergirding of one global task when major support is breaking through only in particular regions. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: House and Nexus research new programmes required in Hong Kong through a site visit to an island fish farm and a PSU on business consultations.

Internal: Images of chastity highlight Easter Week through the characters of Paul of Tarsus and Jack Reed, when House sees movies "Peter and Paul" and "Reds". Joe Nagy lands job with a public relation company just in time to pay the rent on the new ICA apartments.

Contradiction: Building continuous momentum in programmes while syphoning off troops for self-support. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Two teams are sent to Taipei for LENS marketing, Chinese company development, and recruitment for second HDTI in Taiwan.

Internal: House has planning session for next four month's programs and attends one Chinese colleague's wedding.

Contradiction: Having only two Chinese staff to handle all programs and activities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Symposium LENS in Taipei is well received by participants and produces interest of companies involved for further consultations. New HDTP (Human Development Training Program) brochure creates immediate response of five companies to send employees to the program.

Internal: Don Clark comes from Tokyo to lead the Symposium LENS while local Chinese colleagues assist in staff roles for lectures and workshops.

Contradiction: Breaking loose recruitment for the HDTP by identifying, locating and approaching hundreds of local social, economic and cultural institutions that have different reasons for sending participants. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Two Japanese treks with Don Hinkleman, Becky Boone and Ruth Riems bring 23 Japanese through the House. Team of seven brings about a three-pronged success to Development Trek in LENS, inkind and money. Trip to Tiwi (Bicol Region) is hosted by Governor and his aides. In Manila, the Philippine Health Minister is full of affirmation and new avenues to explore. Two 20-container rock orders are received. Union Oil President of the P.G.I. hosts Team for lunch and his man from L.A. presents Team with cheque for Putsan, Tiwi Project. Australian Government flies Team to Zambounga to their largest Aid Project in the world to see if ICA can help them. AID evaluation is underway with British consultant and Cebu guardian. Three companies request script and photos for international magazines. Health Minister from India visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Area Priors' trip is highlighted by reports from Hong Kong, Taiwan, India, England and North America. Hosting has its advantages as House takes Japanese guests to a disco.

Contradiction: Coordinating calendar to include new programmes while 30 ongoing HDPs intensify. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Two workdays are set both in San Mriguel and Sudtonggan by the group in Japan. Team is assigned in social and economic programs in the whole MI-24. Twenty-three Purok leaders are trained for future village work.

Internal: House welcomes group from Osaka, Japan, while sending Steve and Fred to Tiwi to meet the Governor and Mayor of Legaspi City. Week is highlighted by Philippine and Japanese cultural event.

Contradiction: Facing many tasks and figuring how to move quickly while training is going on. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: First harvest of Magtudod Preschool Garden has good pechay squash and cucumber. Dr. Javier visits Langub for skin disease check-up and distributes medicine. Sewing Industry receives Gaisano order for 200 electric fan covers, and 18 sewing workers put up capital of 100 each to buy more materials. Mountain Cluster Preschool teachers participate in 45th anniversary of Davao. Langub Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting with 42 pesos store gain.

Internal: House has workdays and applies Bagrass fertilizer.

Contradiction: Securing more vegetable seedlings and fruit trees in Bureau of Forest Industry for Demonstration Farm. (Wk. 10)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The Japan Urban Planning Council commits three LENS for City Planners — the first one is for June. Toppan Printing Company (the world's second largest) donates design work and 3000 new Town Meeting workbooks roll off the presses.

Internal: Management Centrum arrives to discuss ICA legal and financial plans with House and advisors. Elliott gives a stunning collegium on computers and the future. The first public Toyko House Training Center brochure is finished and ready for distribution.

Contradiction: Structuring The Order: Ecumenical life to be attractive to a few of the many disillusioned salaried men of Japan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Yeosu project initiation gets a big push with the start of three-week circuit by David Hutcheons, Min Sung and Kim Sung Hee, and with \$15,000 grant from Honam (Union) Oil.

Internal: David Elliott arrives on first Management Centrum visit in over a year.

Contradiction: Putting form on the many new possibilities knocking on the door. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: American Women's Club from Seoul visits House and Moon Pak village; the winning story and visible signs result in their giving 500,000 Won (over US\$700). The youth organize for corporate projects and build maneuvers to improve sanitation, service and beauty of their villages; their first project of making ping pong tables is underway.

Internal: House, joined by two from Seoul, holds an 8-hour HD-I course for itself with all members taking leadership roles. The song "Believe" is transformed into Korean.

Contradiction: Building the common story and goal for ITI that will invite future volunteers. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: First session of Imaginal Education has impact on resident volunteers and advisors in spring training series which includes Imaginal Education and CS-I. Okinawa circuit is off to a slow start as Bob Hanson and David Reese take a 27-hour boat trip to Naha to begin 10 days of LENS recruitment and Town Meeting set-up and facilitation. Rob Duffy joins them, and Mr. Tsukamoto arranges business trip to coincide with village Town Meeting. Housing for the Team is provided by the Roman Catholic and Anglican Bishops.

Internal: House sends out Mr. A. Watanabe, long-time colleague and advisor, to become part of the Regional Team in Hiroshima.

Contradiction: Creating and sticking to a new recruitment strategy for the many scheduled events. (Wk. 2)

Another registration comes in, as a result of a phone pitch, from a company sending another employee for training (making third time of LENS participation). Long-awaited film showing introduces neighbors to the world scope of ICA work. Third quarterly newsletter (bilingual) is ready for printing.

Internal: Modules pedagogy prepares staff for a Golden Week of modules leadership training workshops. Second "Great Wisdom" collegium allows House to share in historical and current wisdom of men and women from different cultures.

Contradiction: Holding tension between individual journeys and corporate missional activity while shifting response to LENS from "that looks like a good idea" to "I will be there". (Wk. 3)*

External: Workshop is conducted for Women's Outreach Centre on practical implications of their study of *The Third Wave*. Newsletter focusing on development programmes and volunteer opportunities is printed.

Internal: Regional Team gathering for two days, with Alan Hawke on holiday from Newman, is highlighted by his report on being the Order in Newman. Barbara gets full-time pianist-vocalist job; the Bakers celebrate their sixth wedding anniversary.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: One-day consultation with Home Visitors of Mary and their co-workers (125 persons) is strategic program held for Detroit neighborhood parishes.

Internal: Bonanza week of inking — lawnmower, premier tool kit and 40 gallons of paint from True Value, five photographs from the Plante Company, eight plants, five chairs, a dresser, a table, 20 sheets of panel and 20 2x4s, seven lamps, three pillows, three statues and two yellow bug-light bulbs.

Contradiction: Internalizing compelling life-giving story of expanding program symbolized in the new training center that releases people from negativism and hopelessness. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

Internal: Collegium on Council preparation and tragic fire in Hoboken spark discussions on long-range and practical consideration of movement strategy.

Contradiction: Jumping over the hurdle of lease signing to unleash Regional Team energy fully. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Ellen Howie returns from Charleston, West Virginia, with exciting report on Community LENS in housing projects. Visit with Institute on Man and Science for serious conversation on Project Documentation. Team distributes 500 brochures for Imaginal Methods workshops — six paid registrations are received.

Internal: Panchayat visit is occasion for colleague gathering, including a Troy physician, George Saxton, who once considered volunteering for 5th City Health Outpost when he taught in Chicago.

Contradiction: Tracking people as well as programs. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Colleagues from three metros and representing four sectors gather for HD-I course at Fernbrook Conference Center. Pedagogues for HD-I bring theoretic expertise backed by years of exciting work in Human Development in both the villages and the urban. Metro Research Nights in Harrisburg and Philadelphia demonstrate that there is a core ready for an HDZ which includes their community.

Internal: *The World Challenge* reading on use of computers in villages inspires heated discussion on village readiness for computers in the near future.

Contradiction: Building a realistic plan of the results of Dialogue Two. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Petersburg, Virginia core meets with leaders of two opposing groups and acts out role of trans-establishment reconciliation as Petersburg Consult is scheduled to occur April 30-May 5. Team dramatizes decision to take responsibility for Computer Paradigm by signing pre-incorporation document. Two team members attend North American Guardians' Meeting in Chicago.

Internal: Team celebrates 50th birthday of Jim Fenton and return of Codie Smith to the House after a bad fall in which she broke her arm. Larry Ward is sent out to participate in July Council preparation.

Contradiction: Enabling all to see that flying five kites with two strings in a windstorm is possible and fun! (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: First Starks workday this May proceeds with work on three fronts. First draft of Training, Inc. planning grant proposal in completed. Kendra completes 20 miles of Boston's annual Hunger Walk which raised \$275,000. Another Dartmouth student is confirmed for volunteer term in Azpitia.

Internal: Including cluster youth in Panchayat selection process provides an occasion for "taking responsibility" and a huge number of 'A' grades come in all four report cards.

Contradiction: Expanding ways that Boston colleagues can provide marketing and development support for Starks Enterprises Corporation. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: First May Saturday workday with Starks and Boston colleagues repairs Chintz door, de-winterizes bases of buildings, works on earth closet toilet, and begins graveling parking lot to make it driveable. Jim and Judy do slide show presentation of "Revitalization of a Rural Economically Depressed Town: Starks, Maine Project" for Greater Boston Organizational Development Conference in Springfield, Massachusetts. Wendy visits contacts in Aroostook for Maine Community Development Conference, and Tim runs workshop for Boston Indian Council of MicMac issues.

Internal: House celebrates with post-workday dance in Rome (Maine) and with House Church celebrated by John Bengel. Colleague David Morton donates his '75 Omega which greatly relieves car difficulties.

Contradiction: Enabling diverse issues to focus power on weekend workdays. (Wk. 4)*

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Visit to Entrelacs, a county coverage town in the Laurentians, reveals that after four years many things have been accomplished and there is another way into the *Caisse Populaire* network. East-West exchange goes on with Alex and Irene Lepage visiting H.J.M., Entrelacs, Quebec, and St. Anne de Beaupre. Jamaica development proposals are presented to Royal Bank as first of four Canadian banks in Jamaica is visited.

Internal: In the midst of sunrise Quarter IV planning, House experiences the Wayside Inn image as Robert Booher passes through on his way to the Atlantic Academy and Richard Kitney arrives to do CICA Board Meeting preparations.

Contradiction: Re-imaging recurring challenges. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Colleague and executive of fibreglass company arranges Lion Club presentation of LENS methods which enlivens community leadership in Erin and sets stage for cross-sector programme. Mississauga youth attend Saturday pedagogy at House in preparation for two high school events, a Student Planning Council and a Global Issues Symposium. Leadership roles will be filled by students of St. Martin's High School, who were part of the Regional Consult and led their own Youth Forum in November, 1981.

Internal: A week of celebration — champagne breakfast over Bill Edwards' recent work permit, Irish coffee for Bernard's birthday and strawberry chocolate cake for Diane's 16th birthday.

Contradiction: Developing effective implementation and reporting mechanisms that empower the corporate thrust and team participation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Pembroke core reviews Algonquin College class and describes power to change lives through consensus methods in the classroom. Beachburg documentation begins with list of accomplishments since Symposium and Colloquy. Two receptions for Sir James Lindsay plant image of ICA as agent of international development. Senator Florence Bird, Professor Norma Walmsby and Douglas Roche, M. P. from Edmonton agree to be on Board.

Internal: Quarter celebration cabaret and midnight dessert culminate the quarter.

Contradiction: Experiencing being a wallflower who is asked by five princes to dance. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Region Halifax hosts Area Council in Moncton. Atlantic Potential Academy is accelerated by tremendous inkind support from the city for Area Council.

Internal: House bulges with people and spirit on Easter weekend for Area Council as "Imitations" provides spirit backdrop for Council. House skits and Easter Bunny rock House with side-splitting hilarity.

Contradiction: Moving on the recruitment and development targets that will release paid registrations for the Atlantic Potential Academy. (Wk. 1)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY

External: A Mexican guardian, Dr. Enrique Dulanto, sets up a presentation of the ICA to the *Fundacion Mexicana para Desarrollo Rural* in Queretaro, a private enterprise foundation for Rural Development. Enthusiastic reception by the businessmen leads to a proposed meeting in May with FMRD *promotores* and a visit to their projects in the states of Queretaro and Guanajuato. A second presentation of the ICA to two voluntary organizations in Mexico City leads to an invitation to do a GWF in one of the poorest *barrios* in Mexico. San Camilo leadership plan a workday to prepare the community centre for the LENS in May.

Internal: House sends out Araceli Mathews to teach in the Peru HDTs and Robert Rank for interchange visit with Guatemala.

Contradiction: Shifting into a lower gear because of fewer staff while still maintaining the necessary momentum to get to the destination. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: IDB, EEC and CIDA reports and systems are worked on with Management Trek from both Brussels (Jim Meyers) and Chicago (Linda Barnes). Jamaican Potential Coordinating Committee meeting and Woburn Lawn leaders meeting plan the *Jamaican Potential II*, including the fourth year celebration for Woburn Lawn HDP. Life of Jamaica donates J\$500 for the Cluster. Staff attends Jack's Hill Community Council AGM in St. Andrew overlooking Kingston which begins with the singing of "Iron Men". The eighth Cluster Leaders meeting is held with the fifth Cluster *VOICE* being distributed.

Internal: The seven "sojourners in preparation for internship" receive blue notebooks, red *Journals* and global priority cards with House Church reception.

Contradiction: Moving down the train track 100 miles an hour while putting together the train. (Wk. 2)*

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Two solid Community Forums in the valley signal receptivity and potential for further programming. Donation of typewriters creates possibility of Training Center typing class. Completion of government financial accountability signifies viability of local management systems.

Internal: House and community receive Jose and Zenaida Armas and family and send Jim Newkirk to cluster consult in Barlovento.

Contradiction: Confirming registrations and financial undergirding for HDTs. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: The first mobilization treks to New *Nucleo* villages are smashing success. La Boca village has 40 at guild and stake meetings. House plaques start to appear all over villages. INAGRO (Government Agricultural Agency) assigns full-time Agricultural Instructor to the *Nucleo*.

Internal: Jon Jenkins' enlivening presence merits a "Non *Copenragen*" send out.

Contradiction: Keeping ahead of selves on manuals, treks and government delivery of basic services. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Week of whirlwinds includes donations from Gillette and Coca-Cola, new mayor of Lampa being appointed, completion of quarter planning, evaluation meeting by teachers of children's programmes, and Pepsi manager becomes *bienhechore* (monthly pledger). Week culminates in grand celebration inaugurating new location of *La Cocina* (community kitchen) with House, teachers and guardian angels of *La Cocina*. Census of nation is accomplished in 24-hour miracle using thousands of student volunteers.

Internal: House celebrates (complete with white russians) completion of quarter planning, luxuriates in whirlwind visit of Fr. Rafael Davila with stories from around the world, and participates in national Census Day.

Contradiction: Using the new harness to win the race in the midst of tracks changing. (Wk. 3)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Team receives Ford Foundation grant application approval for US \$24,500, funding the Rio Bonito Municipality project for next 12 months. Local woman signs contract to do five-month adult literacy class in Bracana (the difficulty is finding someone with enough education — 4th grade — to qualify as a teacher). Community struggles with practical proposals to deal with contradictions in second part of Community Planning Series.

Internal: Champagne gushes forth as House celebrates Ford Grant — representing a donation five times larger than any other received in Brasil.

Contradiction: Keeping the other lions quiet while completing Community Planning Series victories. (Wk. 3)*

QUARTER IV WEEK FIVE

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports a grant of \$14,000 from Honam Oil (Caltex) symbolizing depth of corporation support for ICA in Korea. Rio de Janeiro reports receiving Ford Foundation grant application approval for US\$24,500 to fund the Rio Bonito Municipality project for next 12 months. Chicago reports a North American patron sends a major gift to ICA on her birthday. The key contradiction lies in the arena of meshing Development Centrum circuits globally with crowded regional programme calendars.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that a collegium on the Global Ritual Experiment reminds Nexus that we not only *do* the Daily Office, we *are* the Daily Office. Initial systems are created to document and undergird the *Journal* and Order Study selection processes. Analysis of the state of ES-I pulls together reflection on courses in North America, India, Europe and in the Global Academy. Hong Kong sends Jim Bell to the Global Academy and Transposition Lab. The *IMAGE* on Human Motivity moves into the final stages of writing as titles are consensed upon and final writing takes place. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning from all that needs to be done that which is the strategic next move.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports work in Hong Kong on planning Advisors' formation event, Kuala Lumpur troops conduct LENS blitz in Jakarta. Chicago completes program collegium series with Closing Program Marketing Deals, Program Fee Structure, and Program Brief Creation. North American Camp curriculum moves to daily and weekly time designs and keystone events plan. *SEAPAC Soundings* resumes publication after six-month suspension and now uses word processor; Petersburg, Virginia Community LENS results in symbolic reconciliation of 400 years of division and necessity of creating futuric primal community. The key contradiction lies in the arena of working through cross-centrum/cross-post tasks, for example July assignments, computer data updating and Regional Analysis Charts, in the midst of heavy missional post demands, and ensuring backup for each region in the midst of total program swirl.

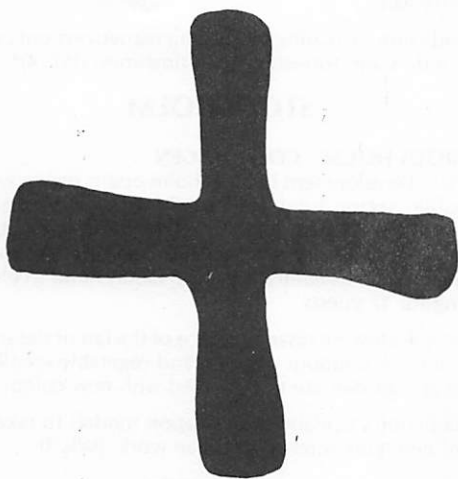
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports Management trek to Kaula Lumpur Region results in income and expense schedules being completed for Region and Malaysian audit. Hong Kong reports the completed Japan and Korea trek clarifies National General Ledger work. Chicago reports final conversation and celebration to send out auditors; and then the total Management Centrum celebrates with steak dinner at Ponderosa Steak House for lunch, which illuminates how high drama in the midst of mundane tasks creates motivity. The key contradiction lies in the arena of uncertainty as to the finished products by June 30 and to the shifts relative to July effecting effective management of time and troops.

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: The Lamego Guilds celebrate ten visible signs in first Cluster Project actuation — a Health Fair, foundations dug for cultural centers, road marked for access to fields, First Aid class (a huge contradiction in North East Portugal), Adult Education Program, signs erected for fruit processing industry, dairy farm, greenhouses and for a health center, and first program in after-school activities is held. Visit of Dutch Ambassador to Lamego is a huge success with hundreds of welcoming Portuguese at cluster village and municipal government. Bishop, President, Board and Team watch the Ambassador cut the first vine in preparation for a new health center.

Internal: The staff in Lamego send off nine full-time participants for Formation Fortnight.

Contradiction: Training leadership to continue work on visible signs while at the same time the consult systems take off at a rapid rate. (Wk. 1)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Third LENS this year is held with 19 directors of Perkins, a division of Massey Ferguson, producing interest in taking the method further in the company. Intending volunteer returns from Formation Fortnight and finalizes plans for going to Kenya; another woman commits herself to sojourn training programme prior to going to Kenya in July.

Internal: Furniture is moved into new 23-room Servite Order property, and House celebrates with champagne while awaiting permission to occupy new facility.

Contradiction: Operating out of "no-mans land" while waiting on the Servite Order's structural alteration timeline. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House is impacted by Media Task Force and grounded in Order history with reflections on the future with colleagues, Fr. Wyatt of Manchester and Rev. Bill McKaig of Glasgow.

These are the words of the LORD of Hosts:

*Do not listen to what the prophets say,
who buoy you up with false hopes,
the vision they report springs from their own imagination,
it is not from the mouth of the LORD.*

*Am I a god only near at hand, not far away?
Can a man hide in a secret place and I not see him?
Do I not fill heaven and earth?

Internal: Feet-on-the-table session allows House and guests to walk through the year in Glasgow Region and push for new images for the future.

Contradiction: Holding together diverse components of the quarter which will enable new thinking and changes to emerge. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Joan Weeks joins the House Team on Bristol circuit including visit to community festival exhibition of *Bhangra* dancing and animated discussion of computer training with Bristol couple. Local church visit opens the door for a meeting with Cardiff urban chaplain.

Internal: Circuit victories are celebrated with picnic supper on a balcony overlooking ancient city of Bath.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional programme momentum while summer crunches are arriving early. (Wk. 5)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Four from House and three others from France take part in Formation Fortnight. Ethical Response course is reported to have "good spirit for our time". Two from Regional Team write the newsletter.

Internal: Arrival of Margaret Braun from Toronto and Cathy Bishop from Sydney, and hearing a report from Yugoslavian youth movement and a lecture on Teilhard de Chardin all enrich House.

Contradiction: Working out of a long vision when springtime tempts fragmented exploration. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Formation Fortnight ends. Having hosted 102 participants, Nexus moves into Lamego Consult and IERD preparation without missing a beat.

Internal: Nexus moves residence and Centrum offices to new centre; planning for the rest of the year is done in Week 1 of Week 4, and week ends with celebration and dancing into the rest of the year.

* NOTE: The * indicates the first printing of a new report.

Contradiction: Getting through the paralysis of "no money" to building a plan for the next six months. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Continental Women's Course is launched with 25 present from Glasgow, London, Bristol/Cardiff, Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, and Frankfurt with Brussels women's study group and House as faculty, resulting in the demonstration of new methods of researching the Revolutions and the emergence of a self-conscious network of care. Whole House participates in four-day BF 60,000 consultation in Brugge to train Indonesian Government Officials in methods of regional catalysis. *The Third Wave* study completes sixth session with all day forum and celebration.

Internal: House concentrates on recovery of humanness as a team with weekly "going sane" evening studying Dr. Jean Baker Miller's book, *Toward A New Psychology of Women*, and celebrates Rose Casswell's 28th birthday (cinema and restaurant) as foursome—first time House goes out together.

Contradiction: Discovering that, with an absolute explosion of mission and implosion of spirit, indicies of sociological accountability for mission have disappeared and now need to be discovered for Quarter IV planning. (Wk. 12)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Six people from the Region attend Formation Fortnight in Brussels, including three from Ludwigshafen core. Bishop of Lamego spends the night at the House en route from appointment with Miserior, Catholic funding agency, and House prepares a real Bishop's room.

Internal: Yvonne goes to IERD meeting in London and Katherine goes to staff LENS on the St. Josse community and for the Fortnight. New job schedule is irregular, but flexible, giving needed Day 1 time.

Contradiction: Capturing and releasing this year's victory and the necessary historical residue critical for future of the Movement in Germany together with implementing survival tactics in the financial arena. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week is intensified as House looks at Imaginal Education Course Pedagogy Manual, in depth, in preparation for training the Regional Team as faculty for the Imaginal Education event at the end of May. House also entertains three prospective volunteers who come looking for information and mails response to four others as inquiries keep coming in regularly.

Internal: House pauses to examine closely the past and look at the future in an all-day Sunday planning session, and Kathy Bishop of Australia arrives for a stay on her trek through Europe.

Contradiction: Creating a consensus for future regional strategy when all House preparation is intensely for the "now". (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: House sends out invitations for *The Third Wave* Seminar to be held in June. Team writes up procedures for *Gemeinde Forum* in Hamburg, and colleague leads second workshop leaders training of ten people. Regional Team evaluates the year's accomplishments and implications.

Internal: Roundtable with Turkish guests illuminates parallel perspectives of heart/mind and right brain/left brain.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity on possible programmatic thrusts in Berlin while realizing there is no clear strategy regionally without one continentally. (Wk. 5)*

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Two two-day workshops are held with a total of 44 seminarians from Urbano University. A presentation to the Women's Guild of Santa Susannah Church results in the scheduling of a one-day workshop and the possibility of funding for other programs.

Internal: RS-I for House members comes off as a great event for all. Training Center takes on a new look as collegium tables are repaired and revarnished and new Earth rise is painted for the entry hall.

Contradiction: Creating motivating maneuvers out of a huge array of do's and fore-shortened timelines. (Wk. 4)*

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Development in Stockholm opens new possibilities for public sector funding. The Danish *Sundhedsstyrelsen* approves upgrading of medical job because of ability to use the local language and also because the ICA "appears to be humanitarian in its nature." Hansen family holds a celebrative evening for 17 guests.

Internal: Following disappearance of the last of the snow and receiving contributions of plants and vegetable seedlings, the House and garden are transformed with new colour.

Contradiction: Updating formulation models to take advantage of emerging interest in urban work. (Wk. 3)

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: The third world dimension is held at Roundtable with the presence of Connie Wideyatma and a guest from the State of Goa in India. Development trek to Linz, Salzburg and Graz Metros nets new colleagues as well as funding. House attends the Annual Meeting of the Austrian United Methodist Conference; a Conference action was to introduce the ICA by granting a letter of referral and acknowledging the Methodist Connectional System and the Area Prior's relationship to the Methodist Church.

Internal: Re-exposure to the Historic Church as House circuits from *Stift* to Chapel to *Stift* reveals that faith, hope and love continue to be manifest in many forms.

Contradiction: Getting said clearly that ICA is not just another competitor for funds and program in an already overcrowded field in both public and private structures. (Wk. 5)*

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA

External: Cluster holds first Water System Guild Meeting with Council Chief and Secretary, People's Council President, two ICA staff and seven representatives from five villages present. Cluster villages finish proposals session of Consult as sixth village finally joins the process.

Internal: House has numerous workshops, collegiums, conversations and major workday in preparation for Governor's visit on March 16th.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on numerous advantages at the local level to establish methods for extending to the *markaz* when the staff has not taken time to think it through corporately. (Wk. 10)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Training program continues as Regional Team moves to cluster site for expanded training in village meeting methods in preparation for launching new clusters. Nelson goes to Ghana to do series of village meetings.

Internal: Jean-Claude Kouadio is received as an intern — the first Ivorian intern.

Contradiction: Training new people fast enough to keep up with missional thrust. (Wk. 12)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Staff meets Professor Udekwo's friend who is a new Secretary in the Ministry of Internal Affairs, opening a new door on the visa quota. Imodi CDC says yes to V.F., first in Alekun—Ifesowapo L.G.A., with Archdeacon Ajayi's support. Araromi health document is ready for use in marketing future programmes.

Internal: Task force arenas are assigned, and quarter's plan is refined and integrated with the internal House design.

Contradiction: Building boldness and courage into Team's actions that produce victory without being victim to the situation. (Wk. 2)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Development team secures two booths in two trade fairs for mat and toy sales while Kapini village women's industry secures K 1,100 order. The High Commissioner of Zambia to Canada meets with MP and staff for site visit. Zambia Steel donates two of six blackboards for two preschools, and Roundtable supplies doors and windows for village clinic. Green signal is given by Headmen to open fifth preschool in Diamond of Zambia.

Internal: House does a documentation workshop to prepare for Global Council, and first Roundtable of the quarter includes Copperbelt team.

Contradiction: Guaranteeing to villages that want to start preschools that House will support them in their endeavour, rather than do it for them. (Wk. 1)*

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Site visits to Kabiro by Barclays Band and UNICEF and the submission of Ford Foundation II proposal highlight week of long-range focus in development. Second planning meeting is held with guardians on "African Assembly For Local Development", while Sections A, B, and C meet to add input. Team of staff and guardians write manual for Health Care-takers training program.

Internal: Staff returns from field with great victories, and Nelson Hjenga arrives from Abidjan as first of advance team for AALD.

Contradiction: Getting organized to take second breath for a quarter filled with major happenings. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: Village circuit participation increases following Tiriki S. Location Consult. Village leaders visit Ministry of Co-operatives about crop marketing and the Ministry of Agriculture about kitchen garden demonstrations. Three people from each House in Section A gather in Kalwani-Shamalago for Section Meeting.

Internal: House repairs begin with cementing and plastering of a room and kitchen construction as tomatoes are transplanted in garden, and House hosts Section Meeting celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring sub-locations honour commitment to provide accommodation for circuiters. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Location Consult set-up proceeds smoothly as over 2500 villagers attend sub-location meeting to select representatives to attend Location Consult. Gathama-Gatira-Ngamburi villages produce 70 people to complete two-year timeline as part of Muthithi Sub-location planning.

Internal: House prepares for Location Consult and District Commissioner's visit by cleaning and redecoring House including the creation of seven sub-location tracking charts which cover one whole wall.

Contradiction: Having undeveloped communication structures and programme realization modes to care for both villages and circuiters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: 116 village leaders attend Village Leaders Conference signing up for village circuits, VLI and consult experience in other villages from their own area. U.S. AID Nairobi representatives visit Kamweleni HDP and Muputi Cluster with suggestions for funding proposals. Kamweleni House completes first circuit to Masii and Mitaromi Locations since the impact with great implementations begun.

Internal: House sends out project director A. Mwamose to go and teach Village Development Meeting to Kamweleni HDTI as a support force for only one day.

Contradiction: Scheduling meetings with government timeline in mind while getting clear on new two-day circuit model to each village and coordinating C.C.F. input scheme in Muputi. (Wk. 3)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The Nexus spends the week preparing and sending out teams to the HDTI in Bangalore and to the Methods Academy in Calcutta. This includes ensuring enough money, curriculum refinement, materials preparation, ticketing and faculty briefing. Mass Community Forums begin in Khandala Block (Jawale) and Wardha Block (Sevagram).

Internal: The "9 to 5" song from GRC captures imagination of the House and allows renewed spirit as colleagues return from Australia, Chicago and Delhi.

Contradiction: Finding ways to handle practical enablement so as not to debilitate the exciting demands of the mission. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Speaking engagement at Aurangabad Rotary Club with the global film strengthens frame and demonstrates living through the President's visit. Introductory call with CEO (# 1 man for district government) promises a good relationship in the future. Team spends four days "polishing" Athwad, a district project, for upcoming site visit by German Ambassador.

Internal: Meeting between community leadership and auxiliary over "squatter's" living in ICA building is reminder that local people are our first priority with our frame.

Contradiction: Holding quality impact events during festive marriage season with few translators. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Team hosts a site visit to Chikhale by the Maharaja of Jodpur. Local guardian and contractor for training centre completes construction schedule before the monsoon, and teams begins repairs on a second primary school building in the Cluster at Beloli village. Another eight Gram Sabhas are completed during the week.

Internal: After receiving report on Area Check Signals Meeting, House finalizes quarter timeline. On Friday village leader invites House to participate in Satya Narayana Puja (special worship associated with Truth and new beginnings).

Contradiction: Reconfiguring into teams that will draw forth creativity and push all to the limit of corporate responsibility. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

External: Government engineer visits Khambale to take measurements for the preschool and signs a certificate for the release of 50 bags of cement.

Internal: Team gets loan from Canara Bank for 20 sheep for Khambala.

Contradiction: Finding a teacher for the preschool. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE

External: Four cluster farmers meet with Dr. Sapare of Kirloskar Consultants and Canara Bank; and the farmers decide to go ahead with the Wadgar Lift Irrigation Scheme; nearly all local money is in hand. Zagalwadi collects local money for painting; Wadgoan collects money for TV application, and Lohom Youth *Mandal* type registration application. Women's team visits 26 women in preparation for Women's Industry and are surprised in one village to discover that the women have already been saving and want to register their *Mahile Mandal*.

Internal: Ashram is like S.T. Bus, sending colleagues George Knott to Budhoda and Sherod Raut to Vaviharsh and receiving Prabha Bhalerao and Ramesh Jadhav from Chikhale. Ashram experiences the grounding of the song, "Jagruti" with the presence of more women in the Ashram. Surprise collegium on ten largest nations of the world gives many new images and reminder of both the gap and the demand to be one globe.

Contradiction: The need to create new images and use methods that enable village people to see that they have everything necessary to take care of the village. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE

External: Nalla Bunding meeting and site survey are held in Maale and Maslewade, recognizing that shortage of cement may slow down scheme and interrupt several quarter projects. Loan surveys are conducted in three villages; some schemes, where loans are readily available, will get quickly underway. In Kalondi, a women's meeting is held and funds are collected for a future society. Maale celebrates Dr. Ambedkar Jayanthi's birthday and earlier in the week has a feast.

Internal: Karune Khamble successfully makes her first witness. Long awaited table arrives; and more survey forms are printed and they are disappearing at an alarming rate.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move on the loan survey as the basis for economic development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA

External: Team collects Rs. 175 for the *Ambar Charkha* shed, attends a Rotary meeting and constructs a urinal. Team visits guardians, sets date for global film show and does a *shramdan* for the Shivaji statue unveiling. Drinking water tank is fixed, and the B.D.O. visits.

Internal: House does quarter planning and a training session on Circle Cluster preparation. John McAdam works with Ashram three days, and George Knott is assigned for three months.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move into the cluster with few troops and little money. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM

External: The bakery reopens with a larger market and new management. The team opens a shop near Gandhi Hospital for selling the bread. Sevagram initiates Maharashtra cluster survey with whole House participating in Nandora survey.

Internal: House celebrates completion of a week of priorship training with the birth of the Borker family baby girl.

Contradiction: Building up the bread market. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI

External: 35 Cluster women and 15 women from Rajura and Chandrapur participate in GWF, Women's Centre inspection and *bhajan* session. *Shramadan* with donated bullock carts brings 235 stones for Gandhi statue base. Site visit by Panchayat Samiti Mr. Moon and veterinarian officer Dr. Raje for cow survey is collegial. First visit to District Chief Executive Officer Mr. Narayan sets up May site visit; and visits with District Public Works Division Executive Engineer Mr. Rathi and guardians Sapre and Tambekar continue journey toward HDA (Human Development Association) establishment. Tembhurwahi village formally celebrates Dr. Ambedkar's birthday at flag-raising ceremony.

Internal: Ashram meeting decides Quarter IV commissions and enablement teams — Mahatma, Shivaji, and Ambhedkar.

Contradiction: Building Quarter IV plan that will breathe new life into the Ashram, Cluster and bi-metro. (Wk. 2)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD

External: Villagers accompany ICA staff to see silk-worm farm in operation. Two villagers submit applications for silk-worm farm training to District Industry Commission.

Internal: Dabhad *Ashram* becomes battleground for children from village and ICA staff while celebrating *Holi* festival with coloured water.

Contradiction: Missing the week's depth planning brings few victories. (Wk. 11)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: A Managing Director's visit to Cluster enables helpful conversation with village on their participation and results in donation of tube lights. Mr. Dethe brings Harayana Government letter inviting ICA to work in that state and opens the way for funds and local authorization. Call from the Netherlands' Embassy reveals consultancy and funding offers from Dutch Government.

Internal: House sends out John Umakant and Kevin, concluding first month of Cluster actuation.

Contradiction: Finding big enough hammers to nail down slippery cash jeep, appointments and information. (Wk. 4)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Village meeting with two government officials, five bank executives, six executives from a fertilizer company and 90 villagers from Gunjurpalya is highlighted by spontaneous witnesses to ICA's effectiveness in awakening villagers to their own possibilities. Two Sikh villagers sign up for HDTI. Over 60 participants are committed for HDTI, and Rs. 12,000 of inkind is being collected. First contact with a Bangalore company results in immediate gift of Rs. 5000.

Internal: Australia, America, Malaysia, England, Germany, and the states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh are all represented on eight-person HDTI set-up team.

Contradiction: Maintaining vigilance on every front for HDTI set-up when numerous "yesses" tend to lull House into a false sense of security. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Bustee Leaders Institute of 30 participants demonstrates new five-day construct and opens possibilities for work in Howrah — two villages — and initiates Women's Guild. Unsolicited programme requests increase as one LENS and six Imaginal Education courses are scheduled for Quarter II.

Internal: Two adults and E.G. experiment with six and four year old hosting ritual and celebrate by initiating E.G. to English through film *All That Jazz*.

Contradiction: Discerning the formation strategy in the midst of shifting recruitment constituency of Methods Academy. (Wk. 4)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Five treks are on the road. Computer systems are redone and interchanged with Hong Kong.

Internal: Spending four evening sessions on self-support brings Nexus closer to future.

Contradiction: Riding the anomalies — "every one is clear about the situation, but what do you do about it." (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Date is set in June for high-level Imaginal Education course with participants from Ministry of Education, each of the Malaysian universities, and other training agencies. Course is to be co-sponsored by INTAN — the government employee training institute. S\$10,000 (Singapore dollars) is received from Chen Foundation in Singapore.

Internal: House watches the outcome of the national elections with avid interest as many advocates retain or move into key political positions.

Contradiction: Waiting out post-election period of settling-in, while anxiety mounts over our visa and government status. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Thirteen Leadership Methods Modules (two hours each) are set with local banks. Key LENS visit is made with LPP Medan (newly established plantation training and research center), and Goodyear plantation representative drops by office to request Global Language School information. Although no money and national election slow-down occur at the same time, Kecamatan circuit helps launch cow program.

Internal: Highlights of week are assignments collegium on care for your colleagues, House charting training on *The World Challenge*, and a great celebration with video films at the American library.

Contradiction: Getting prospects, who have shown interest, to commit themselves with firm dates set before June. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: National elections happen without incident. Soedjai is pleased with team's speech translation and writing, and he intensifies his yes to giving one person a visa for next year to translate correspondence. Metro visits and a visit to Kelapa Dua are wonder-filled events. Global Advisory Board meeting reveals depth interest and willingness to support and further ICA work by Indonesian Foundation founders.

Internal: House creates new team names — *Garuda* for the E.G. and *Bayu* and *Indra* for the adults — and celebrates end of LENS setup blitz at a Mexican restaurant and with a video viewing of *The African Queen* movie.

Contradiction: Deciding powerful theme for the week which will enable orchestration of time and engagement of troops. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Entire week is geared to bringing off successful consultation with *Bangdes* (rural development agency) held on May 1st, with pedagogy training the day before. Stake visits in Bontoa are a key event as team catches up on demographic facts such as births, illness, new businesses, results of rice harvest and deaths, including that of a six-month-old baby. Approval is received from sponsor for visa extensions and LENS is set with Provincial Health Agency.

Internal: House celebrates a successful government agency consultation and Terry McCabe's return after three weeks in Jakarta during *Minggu Tenang*, the quiet time surrounding national elections, with *ikan gakar*, broiled fish.

Contradiction: Rethinking the quarter strategy implementation for when the election is over. (Wk. 4)*

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Profound address on "Paradigm Shift" at Hong Kong Guardians Meeting triggers exciting response. Okinawa circuit highlights role played by Japanese advisors in LENS Symposium recruitment, and Symposium LENS in Taipei opens possibilities of programme consultations, inhouse LENS and HDTP participation. Entire month's accounting for all five nations, both ICA and O:E, is done in one week with computerized system.

Internal: Roundtable study on *Japan, No. 1* occasions reflection on dynamics producing Japan's economic success as they apply to global human development, and collegium on break-looses in the Philippines updates Team in preparation for Putsan (Tiwi) HDP Consult.

Contradiction: Forging mechanisms of depth interchange that illuminate global/local victories and struggles, thereby enabling strategic prioritization of regional programmes. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: House and Nexus research new programmes required in Hong Kong through a site visit to an island fish farm and a PSU on business consultations.

Internal: Images of chastity highlight Easter Week through the characters of Paul of Tarsus and Jack Reed, when House sees movies "*Peter and Paul*" and "*Reds*". Joe Nagy lands job with a public relation company just in time to pay the rent on the new ICA apartments.

Contradiction: Building continuous momentum in programmes while syphoning off troops for self-support. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Two teams are sent to Taipei for LENS marketing, Chinese company development, and recruitment for second HDTI in Taiwan.

Internal: House has planning session for next four month's programs and attends one Chinese colleague's wedding.

Contradiction: Having only two Chinese staff to handle all programs and activities. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: In-house LENS consults with additional companies emerge as possibilities in the wake of the Symposium LENS Week 3. HDTP Curriculum Syllabus and registration form are printed and ready for distribution with new HDTP brochure. Seven companies are already considering sending employees to the HDTP, while one-day newspaper ad results in six serious inquiries about the HDTP within three days.

Internal: Mong, Tien-Chang (Timothy John Montgomery), newly adopted son of John and Judy Montgomery, arrives at Taipei House three days after his mother arrives from Chicago.

Contradiction: Getting enough momentum on HDTP recruitment to yield 35 participants through contacts with hundreds of social and economic organizations. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Two Japanese treks with Don Hinkleman, Becky Boone and Ruth Riems bring 23 Japanese through the House. Team of seven brings about a three-pronged success to Development Trek in LENS, ink and money. Trip to Tiwi (Bicol Region) is hosted by Governor and his aides. In Manila, the Philippine Health Minister is full of affirmation and new avenues to explore. Two 20-container rock orders are received. Union Oil President of the P.G.I. hosts Team for lunch and his man from L.A. presents Team with cheque for Putsan, Tiwi Project. Australian Government flies Team to Zambounga to their largest Aid Project in the world to see if ICA can help them. AID evaluation is underway with British consultant and Cebu guardian. Three companies request script and photos for international magazines. Health Minister from India visits Sudtonggan.

Internal: Area Priors' trip is highlighted by reports from Hong Kong, Taiwan, India, England and North America. Hosting has its advantages as House takes Japanese guests to a disco.

Contradiction: Coordinating calendar to include new programmes while 30 ongoing HDPs intensify. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Two workdays are set both in San Miguel and Sudtonggan by the group in Japan. Team is assigned in social and economic programs in the whole MI-24. Twenty-three Purok leaders are trained for future village work.

Internal: House welcomes group from Osaka, Japan, while sending Steve and Fred to Tiwi to meet the Governor and Mayor of Legaspi City. Week is highlighted by Philippine and Japanese cultural event.

Contradiction: Facing many tasks and figuring how to move quickly while training is going on. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Mountain Cluster Preschool has closing exercises with 33 graduates. L.H.D.P. receives six boxes of medicine and clinic supplies from International Medical Assistance Canada. Carmen Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting.

Internal: House welcomes Ceferino Garay to join again the Project.

Contradiction: Preparing for doctor's visit to distribute medicine. (Wk. 1)*

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: The Japan Urban Planning Council commits three LENS for City Planners — the first one is for June. Toppan Printing Company (the world's second largest) donates design work and 3000 new Town Meeting workbooks roll off the presses.

Internal: Management Centrum arrives to discuss ICA legal and financial plans with House and advisors. Elliott gives a stunning collegium on computers and the future. The first public Toyko House Training Center brochure is finished and ready for distribution.

Contradiction: Structuring The Order: Ecumenical life to be attractive to a few of the many disillusioned salaried men of Japan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Yeosu project initiation gets a big push with the start of three-week circuit by David Hutcheons, Min Sung and Kim Sung Hee, and with \$15,000 grant from Honam (Union) Oil.

Internal: David Elliott arrives on first Management Centrum visit in over a year.

Contradiction: Putting form on the many new possibilities knocking on the door. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: Cluster digs into various village activities of actuation after first rice seed planting — Moon Pak Village has grand all-village all-day celebration on and around new bridge which they built in addition to a cattle barn. Gui Rae Ri gets its first cattle, begins cowbarn and pasture. Village youth corps are on the move following-up their plans — one of the first projects is toilet sanitation and new buildings.

Internal: Sojourners and village youth complete building a ping pong table and make good use of it.

Contradiction: Creating a great alternative for ITI which calls forth the Human Development Association. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Forty calls during two-week Okinawa circuit bring 35 to 40 yeses, representing all four sectors for the Community LENS in June. The fourth Town Meeting is held in Tamashiro Village in Okinawa with 25 elders, and the Regional Team is invited back to a village that did a Town Meeting in March. The people of Moriyama Cho wine and dine Team and hold an informal meeting of 30 parents and 20 children on issues facing the family in Japan and America. House attendance at formal dedication of a new school and gym and cultural day sets up good relationship in Nagasaki Ken (state).

Internal: House welcomes Rob Duffy to work with Regional Team and Mrs. Gallaway and Nancy Eggert who visit for two weeks, giving all a chance to travel around Kyushu and participate in *Don Taku*, a local festival, along with over 2.5 million people from all over Japan.

Contradiction: Getting into gear again for Imaginal Education, Okinawa LENS, and other Regional Team activities after great week of national holidays. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Golden Week Modules bring fresh faces and old friends together to participate in a total of eight leadership workshops. Bilingual newsletter is mailed to 250 contacts. Mr. Kondo, a Nagoya advisor, sets up three appointments and accompanies the circuit Team on four appointments, as well as hosting Team in his home.

Internal: House participates in global journey of those who care through the Area Fast Day, the Panchayat balloting and the first of three global assignments collegiums.

Contradiction: Tailoring events to awaken, train and engage people of a first world culture. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Staff visits many advisors to report on Quarter III's work and recruits them to ES-I for May 5th. Social Education Director from Numata, a small town in northern Hokkaido, comes to ICA office to set up three or four Global Language Schools from May through September. First trek of the quarter to Shiribeshi tentatively sets up six Town Meetings for next winter. Sapporo Chamber of Commerce sets up LENS for their planning committee in August.

Internal: Ty and Opal Butcher, Roger's parents, visit Shiribeshi with circuit team and compare Japan cows with Wyoming cows. Copy machine maneuver secures a fine machine at low cost for three months and gives opening for permanent low-cost machine.

Contradiction: Firming up jelly-like Golden Week plan one week before the event, with three treks scheduled this week and college classes beginning now. (Wk. 2)

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Internal: Mary Z. Longstreth completes rigorous one-week training for motorcycle instructor's license, opening new avenue for self-support.

Contradiction: Maintaining program momentum while holding tension between four-year strategy implementation and self-support breakthrough. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Regional Team from three metros conducts Family Lab with adult and children's program for Kenner UMC. Sr. Josepha coordinates Biluxi Metro follow-up to Dialogue '81 Region Consult for educators of the diocese with Ruth Wilson as one of the speakers. Religious deeps are touched as Fr. Winus Roten holds week-long pastoral retreat for priests in Minnesota and as Rayne UMC spends an hour on India HDPs and gives \$800.

Internal: Leila McKay completes teaching contract with signatures so as to release salary of \$4500 for 58 days.

Contradiction: Doing the specific and comprehensive in such a style as to "finely" finish projects in motion and launch the needed new for a victorious year. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Dean of I-20 Convocation (Episcopal Diocese) informs House he is not only excited about sponsoring an RS-I but that the Institute's presentation will be the program for the May 20th meeting. Imaginal Education brochure mailing is completed after second printing, and a colleague drops by to pick up more. The same colleague provides fine program reference letter and invites ICA to submit proposal to Community Colleges Humanities Association for fall conference.

Internal: Ritual experiment continues by grounding the meaning of symbols in the paper *Observations On Religious Symbolism* by Mircea Eliade.

Contradiction: Creating the programmatic momentum that pulls the future into the present. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Networks in Tallahassee are expanded through AMO (Associated Migrant Organizations) contract to do workshop in rural economic development and roundtable focused on the Church as Social Pioneer. Callahan Humanities Center reception in Orlando reveals continued community development initiated by Town Meeting five years ago.

Internal: House is honored by Jean Petrick's sojourning and the victory of state championship for Ian's crew team.

Contradiction: Creating fund-raising models which spin story, priorities and rationale to deal with self-support and program deficits. (Wk. 5)*

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: The 35th Global Academy concludes its sixth week with a Grand Ball and Greek Feast. The larger July prep task force begins to arrive, the ninth graders begin to return from their overseas deployment, and the July prep task force gives an enthralling collegium, all of which signals the turning of the Nexus toward July.

Internal: House journeys into the deeps with a collegium on the history of Order: Ecumenical internal life, with the final Wednesday night study of RS-I back-up papers, which is capped off with a serious evaluation, and with a Lab on the Vocational Journey Retreat.

Contradiction: Allowing steadfastness in holding tension between ending the year and preparing for July amidst unclarity about necessary troop configurations. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: A week full of 5th City eventfulness involves every dimension of community life. 5th City Business Careers graduates ninth class at downtown restaurant with 70 attending ceremonies; 5th City Housing Module takes place Wednesday evening with 40 residents exploring possible formation of a property owners' association and utilization of city-sponsored home improvement loans; 5th City Elders Action Program holds major fund raising extravaganza Saturday evening with 200 people viewing elders fashion show; 5th City block clubs host 75 community mothers for Sunday dinner on Mother's Day; 5th City Shopping Center sees laundramat install a dozen new driers; and two dangerous abandoned buildings are demolished and debris is removed with lots levelled.

Internal: As House returns to full size with return of the Vances from their mid-jubilee and Terry Bergdall from the Global Academy, members push towards July with a collegium led by GRA prep team and Roundtable on the principles of Human Development.

Contradiction: Using documentation to open doors to program and training. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Regional Team expands as long-planned Willard Community Center consultation surfaces leadership resolved to bring off neighborhood and relate to five other Lincoln west side associations. Midcrest resolve sharpens as first church film presentation within zone elicits passion of RLDS Church in Lamoni, Iowa for globe and Human Development in the local; participants give contribution to ICA global work. Donna McCleskey becomes registered computer operator in Kansas City House for purpose of putting out 107 proposals for Education Symposium.

Internal: Lorimor House owner makes inspection right after major outside clean up and opens negotiations for another two years of rent-free occupancy.

Contradiction: Broadening participatory yes to participatory approach to Midcrest by Midcrest structures. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Permeators' job in training at Investors Diversified Services (IDS) has exploded from teaching Supervisors Course to training 25 people in Quality Circles groups, 20 PSUs with IDS Life on moving to new offices and exploration of executive strategic planning seminar. Team completes 10 Operational Planning sessions with Corporate Technological Center at Honeywell, with new procedure breakthroughs for one-day planning.

Internal: Elizabeth Loudermilk's 40th birthday celebration is stunning occasion for everyone to celebrate Phase III.

Contradiction: Responding to more telephone calls and opportunities for program than House has time and staff to deliver. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Two workshops facilitated by ICA — Imaginal Education and one on Leadership methods—generate enthusiasm at Annual Parent Involvement Conference of St. Louis Magnet School System. Introductory context to coordination of community schools stimulates excitement in anticipation of five four-hour Leadership Training Labs. Metro core completes *The World Challenge* study and decides to do one more session to pull entire book together in addition to continuing the study sessions with another book.

Internal: House hosts Elsa Bengel and Bruce Williams who journey to St. Louis to serve as consultants at the Magnet School Parent Involvement Conference. Matt Hockley gives one of five speeches at National Honor Society induction ceremony on "Leadership".

Contradiction: Cranking up neighborhood strategy several levels of intensity without losing any momentum re: breakthroughs in education. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Team holds Forum with major Superiors and two Bishops of the Detroit Archdiocese. Fifty people explore Hispanic and Black urban needs and the Church's response in time of sensing these arenas as "new mission field"; the forum is the occasion for calling on three Week I facilitators from as far as East Lansing (Lois Martin) including some from jobs.

Internal: House has great week of physical transformation for the training center — 80-year-old dining room/sun porch is spackled, sanded, patched and painted; dog pen is vigorously cleaned by youth, and new lawn mower is tested with first mowing of the grass.

Contradiction: Keeping the alligators out of your pockets while draining the swamp. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Two Cleveland foundations make contributions to Demonstration Neighborhood Project. The West Collinwood forms for commercial Local Development Corporation are filed by deadline, and conversations are initiated with Case Western Reserve University Medical School students regarding possibilities for third world service.

Internal: The Regional Team meets in Louisville on Kentucky Derby Day for interchange, scheduling, and writing a response to the REP Talking Paper and for fantastic celebration, including mint juleps and Derby pie.

Contradiction: Thinking through appropriate marketing ventures now that will assure adequate program to occur during Quarter I. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Louisville cadre hosts Regional Team meeting on Derby Day including the announcement by one member of six-week volunteer commitment in Azpitia, the premiere showing of *Seeds Of Hope* documenting care, courage, creativity, and corporateness in the city, and a classical Derby Day yard party. Meanwhile profile of the Regional Team rises as three articles appear in Indianapolis papers and the Director of the Urban League commits self to keynote four-sector Symposium.

Internal: Regional Team members attend self-support collegium; local minister plows House garden, and Sisters of St. Francis give \$1,000 for India.

Contradiction: Maintaining the catalytic posture when deadlines loom and victory seems to demand that the House must pick up the slack. (Wk. 5)*

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Weekday RS-I in Witon begins with strong participation and full program fee. Invitation for building benefit concert created by Paterson Metro team. Saturday workday reveals increasing skill on the part of the team.

Internal: Collegium on Council preparation and tragic fire in Hoboken spark discussions on long-range and practical consideration of movement strategy.

Contradiction: Jumping over the hurdle of lease signing to unleash Regional Team energy fully. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Over 300 participate in six Community LENS with Charleston Housing Authority that are held simultaneously during Week 12, following fine weekend of LENS pedagogy (35 around the table). Assembly of communities celebrates the cluster experiment, names the seven keystones for first 90 days of implementation and breaks loose clean-up day in Orchard Manor that gets local front-page news coverage with collection of 14,000 pounds of trash. Eighty-eight people from cluster communities participate in ten-day Community Leadership Training Event.

Internal: Regional Team celebrates completion of first three phases of four-phase (two-year) West Virginia Cluster Experiment with Friday night dinner at Tequila Junction and Saturday night dinner at Max's Allegheny Tavern and three hours of stomping on the waters of the three rivers on board the Gateway Clipper Fleet's party liner.

Contradiction: Maintaining one corporate thrust in the midst of being dispersed. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Imaginal Education courses in Albany and Buffalo train the Regional Team and address the lives of new participants. Workshop with Administrative Boards of five Methodist Churches plans for the celebration of 175 years of Methodism in Troy.

Internal: Kaye Hayes' visit immerses Regional Team in the style of the pedagogue, and House Church at the Schneiders symbolizes presence of House in the Buffalo Metro.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on advantages and opportunities created by courses. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Colleagues from three metros and representing four sectors gather for HD-I course at Fernbrook Conference Center. Pedagogues for HD-I bring theoretic expertise backed by years of exciting work in Human Development in both villages and the urban. Metro Research Nights in Harrisburg and Philadelphia demonstrate that there is a core ready for an HDZ which includes their community.

Internal: *The World Challenge* reading on use of computers in villages inspires heated discussion on village readiness for computers in the near future.

Contradiction: Building a realistic plan of the results of Dialogue Two. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Regional Team experiences self in role of reconciliation as Petersburg, Virginia city LENS brings together the diversity of community in a happening of profound unity — 146 names are listed in LENS document. The office takes on a new look with decor and space re-arranging. Computer Paradigm designs store-opening invitation and pulls together mailing list.

Internal: House celebrates with movie "Arthur" and an art form conversation over pizza feast.

Contradiction: Getting up the courage to tackle the next round of urgent "universes", such as new facility and programmatic thrusts, on other side of Petersburg LENS victory. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: First Starks workday this May proceeds with work on three fronts. First draft of Training, Inc. planning grant proposal in completed. Kendra completes 20 miles of Boston's annual Hunger Walk which raised \$275,000. Another Dartmouth student is confirmed for volunteer term in Azpitia.

Internal: Including cluster youth in Panchayat selection process provides an occasion for "taking responsibility" and a huge number of 'A' grades come in all four report cards.

Contradiction: Expanding ways that Boston colleagues can provide marketing and development support for Starks Enterprises Corporation. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Second May Saturday workday with ten from outside town (New York, Boston and Illinois) works on fire door, tarpapering a wall, building de-winterizing, parking lot leveling, and cleanup and extension of the Wendy Rose Memorial Garden; evening is celebrated with a Heritage Club Dinner — a success with many out of town people coming and making enough to pay for fourth chapter of the Starks History. Augusta (Agency) Guild meets to review successful consultation with Bureau of Permits within the Department of Environmental Protection and to make future plans. Next MicMac conference is set for mid-July on Indian Island.

Internal: Post-workday at House recovers creating own fun through circle games; and House welcomes Wendy's brother Larry for week of collegiality and work at the Cornshop.

Contradiction: Deciding priorities in the midst of fixed and immediate demands. (Wk. 5)*

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Conversations with old Community Forum participants from four to five years ago in Brome and Riviere des Prairies reveal that catalysis and awakenment are the major gifts brought by the Forums which then lead in turn to new community involvement and new project initiatives, symbolized for both communities in community centres. For five nights in a row, stake meetings are held in *Habitations Jeanne Mance* which reveal the foundational challenge to the people of daring to create enough order and stability to maintain a community garden in the middle of inner city Montreal.

Internal: House sends out Marguerite's parents with countless stories to Saskatchewan after they participate in a Forum documentation visit, internal life structures, a trip to the old family house in Quebec City and visits with *Habitations Jeanne Mance* residents.

Contradiction: Covering two major fronts at the same time. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Colleague and executive of fibreglass company arranges Lion Club presentation of LENS methods which enlivens community leadership in Erin and sets stage for cross-sector programme. Mississauga youth attend Saturday pedagogy at House in preparation for two high school events, a Student Planning Council and a Global Issues Symposium. Leadership roles will be filled by students of St. Martin's High School, who were part of the Regional Consult and led their own Youth Forum in November, 1981.

Internal: Week of celebration—champagne breakfast over Bill Edwards' work permit, Irish coffee for Bernard's birthday and strawberry chocolate cake for Diane's 16th birthday.

Contradiction: Developing effective implementation and reporting mechanisms that empower the corporate thrust and team participation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Region's participation in Atlantic Potential Academy continues with Monique Dion leaving on faculty assignment. Effective Conferencing workshops swing into Phase Two of set-up with targetting sessions, brochure at printers and first contacts showing interest. Documentation visit to the Ottawa Valley uncovers excitement over new businesses, new road signs and a big step forward in tourist industry in Beachburg and over the formation of an Economic Development Corporation in Pembroke, complete with song and first contract opening.

Internal: Colleagues throw surprise pre-wedding parties for Michael and Bronwyn.

Contradiction: Putting wheels under Phase Two of Effective Conferencing to continue building momentum after initial excitement of Phase One. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Forty new people participate in three core courses during the week-long Atlantic Potential Academy. Kaye Hayes, Bob Booher and Ottawa R.E.P. join the faculty for the week. Twenty-five programme possibilities emerge from participants' comments.

Internal: R.E.P. House shifts location to Memromcook [sic] for the Atlantic Potential Academy; and during concluding celebration, team sings spring love songs to the "beaus" and "belles" of Hotel Beasejour.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum going through myriad of possibilities and discerning new position of advantages after a break-through Academy. (Wk. 4)*

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY

External: A Mexican guardian, Dr. Enrique Dulanto, sets up a presentation of the ICA to the *Fundacion Mexicana para Desarrollo Rural* in Queretaro, a private enterprise foundation for Rural Development. Enthusiastic reception by the businessmen leads to a proposed meeting in May with *FMRD promotores* and a visit to their projects in the states of Queretaro and Guanajuato. A second presentation of the ICA to two voluntary organizations in Mexico City leads to an invitation to do a GWF in one of the poorest *barrios* in Mexico. San Camilo leadership plan a workday to prepare the community centre for the LENS in May.

Internal: House sends out Araceli Mathews to teach in the Peru HDTS and Robert Rank for interchange visit with Guatemala.

Contradiction: Shifting into a lower gear because of fewer staff while still maintaining the necessary momentum to get to the destination. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: IDB, EEC and CIDA reports and systems are worked on with Management Trek from both Brussels (Jim Meyers) and Chicago (Linda Barnes). Jamaican Potential Coordinating Committee meeting and Woburn Lawn leaders meeting plan *Jamaican Potential II*, including the fourth year celebration for Woburn Lawn HDP. Life of Jamaica donates J\$500 for the Cluster. Staff attends Jack's Hill Community Council AGM in St. Andrew overlooking Kingston which begins with the singing of "Iron Men". The eighth Cluster Leaders meeting is held with the fifth Cluster *VOICE* being distributed.

Internal: The seven "sojourners in preparation for internship" receive blue notebooks, red *Journals* and global priority cards with House Church reception.

Contradiction: Moving down the train track 100 miles an hour while putting together the train. (Wk. 2)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Two solid Community Forums in the valley signal receptivity and potential for further programming. Donation of typewriters creates possibility of Training Center typing class. Completion of government financial accountability signifies viability of local management systems.

Internal: House and community receive Jose and Zenaida Armas and family and send Jim Newkirk to cluster consult in Barlovento.

Contradiction: Confirming registrations and financial undergirding for HDTs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: The first mobilization treks to New Nucleo villages are smashing success. La Boca village has 40 at guild and stake meetings. House plaques start to appear all over villages. INAGRO (Government Agricultural Agency) assigns full-time Agricultural Instructor to the Nucleo.

Internal: Jon Jenkins' enlivening presence merits a "Non Copenragen" send out.

Contradiction: Keeping ahead of selves on manuals, treks and government delivery of basic services. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Team uncovers a great advocate with Sence [sic] for the demonstration LENS with Electromat. First Roundtable held in Sol de Septiembre brings 25 curious people, and an exciting workday the following day transforms four building areas for the upcoming HDTs.

Internal: House receives visits from caring and interested Regional Team members, and more Regional Team members show up making Roundtable in Santiago a great evening of conviviality.

Contradiction: Using every activity as an occasion for recruitment for HDTs. (Wk. 4)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Too much rain postpones final session (proposals to timeline) of Bracana-Tatus Community Planning Series, though House and Rio Bonito colleagues made it to the community with the jeep. Saturday Festival goes ahead as planned with high point being a soccer game between married men and single men (the married men won).

Internal: Martin and Cris Pesek join House for a barbecue and a day at the beach as guests of a Rio Bonito colleague.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the rest of the quarter and the year to cover several critical bases before July. (Wk. 4)*

A grant of \$14,000 from Honam Oil (Caltex) symbolizes depth of corporation support for ICA in Korea. The Chen Si Lan Trust Foundation Singapore grants tenth consecutive gift. Brussels reports St. Gabriel School and its Provincialate triple their contribution to ICA work. Receiving US \$19,000 in hand during Seoul circuit moves Korea close to going "over the top" of the global fiscal objective for 1981-82. The key contradiction lies in the arena of inadequately thought through story and maneuvers on individual prospects resulting from heavy push on the immediate need.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Kuala Lumpur holds signal collegium on the Talking Paper on Hinduism. Hong Kong staff participate in the great Formation Fortnight in Sapporo, Japan; and Brussels closes its Formation Fortnight having had 102 participants. Chicago celebrates with Symond Kock the passing of his oral exams for his Ph.D. Writing blitz on the *IMAGE* on Motivity and the Human Factor produces first complete draft. The key contradiction lies in the arena of troop configuration and year-end demands stretching troops in all directions — course assignments, July prep and on-going centrum systems.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports Bombay Nexus Phase I organizes by fulfilling all the bureaucratic requirements and arranging daily transportation. Chicago designs Retreat construct and Sojourners brochure. Kuala Lumpur and Hong Kong participate in great affirmation of LENS during marketing and recruitment blitz. Kansas City Education Symposium impacts public education and private university audience with new edges. The key contradiction lies in the arena of out-running quarter plan and leaving administrative coverage thin.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports there are glimmerings of getting on top of the mountain as seen with new emphasis on computer use in Management work — ICA/O:E reports are done in one week; Hong Kong pioneers ICA General Ledger and Reports Programmes are being utilized in Kaula Lumpur; and Chicago's inkind proposal work is done on computer, word processor and Amtex. Second winning Management Trek of the year involves more than one nexus as Chicago and Brussels Management team does on-site accounting for Jamaica EEC and IADB grants. 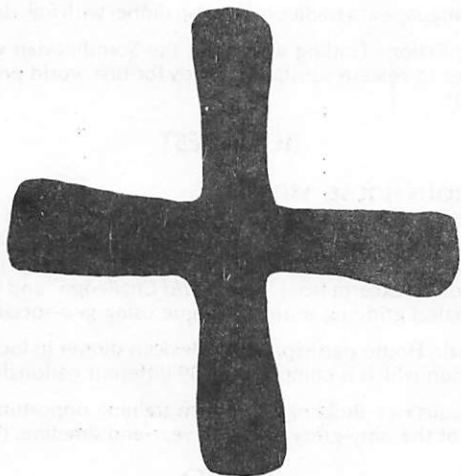

MADRID

Contradiction: Fitting together June programme components before time runs out in a busy May. (Wk. 4)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Leonard Sizer represents House in Area Media Action Task Force, and the circuit of that team finds colleagues ready to respond with their support and advice. Invitations are mailed out for a colleague and guardian dinner/house warming as part of Area Council. New sojourner arrives in time to carry forward preparations for ICA booth at Outdoor Venture Day sponsored by local youth radio station.

Internal: First week in new facility with boxes and odd furniture stacked in every corner proves chaotic with two staff on the road and four with full-time employment, but all is celebrated with a great sunny Saturday in Canterbury which provides an encounter with an age when life did not move with such speed.

Contradiction: Seeing the unclarity in the intent to create a new House. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Joan Weeks joins the House Team on Bristol circuit including visit to community festival exhibition of *Bhangra* dancing and animated discussion of computer training with Bristol couple. Local church visit opens the door for a meeting with Cardiff urban chaplain.

Internal: Circuit victories are celebrated with picnic supper on a balcony overlooking ancient city of Bath.

Contradiction: Maintaining regional programme momentum while summer crunches are arriving early. (Wk. 5)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Work in "impenetrable" depressed urban zone begins and self-support contradiction is solved in one move as Monique takes a job as animatrice.

Internal: Strange comings and goings, war between Argentina and Great Britain, and strident circular from Bombay Nexus blend well with Margaret Tuchman's thoughts on the weirdness of the times.

Contradiction: Spreading the load over broader, sturdier Regional Team. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Formation Fortnight ends. Having hosted 102 participants, Nexus moves into Lamego Consult and IERD preparation without missing a beat.

Internal: Nexus moves residence and Centrum offices to new centre; planning for rest of year is done in Week 1 of Week 4, and week ends with celebration and dancing into rest of year.

Contradiction: Getting through the paralysis of "no money" to building a plan for the next six months. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Six people from the Region attend Formation Fortnight in Brussels, including three from Ludwigshafen core. Bishop of Lamego spends the night at the House en route from appointment with Miserior, Catholic funding agency, and House prepares a real Bishop's room.

Norad phones to announce a 500,000 kroner (US\$85,000) grant for ICA India. Marianne Baasch returns from Brussels Fortnight and pledges three days per week to House.

Internal: Whole house shows its colours when forced to speak local language at a traditional Danish dinner with folk dancing.

Contradiction: Finding a crack in the Scandinavian welfare mindset to release substantial funds for first world program. (Wk. 5)*

BUDAPEST**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Completion of development circuit nets \$1550. Maneuver planning is done for continuing development and integrated circuiting. Roundtable participants engage in lively muse on an excerpt from "The World Challenge" and engage in practical gridding during dialogue using geo-social grid.

Internal: House participates in Mexican dinner in local congregation which is composed of 19 different nationalities.

Contradiction: Building solid team training opportunities in midst of the nitty-gritty, meeting year-end timeline. (Wk. 6)*

External: Imaginal Education course is completed with ten students of the Adult Education Department of University of Lagos. IERD team of Sir James Lindsay and Paul Schrinjen have nine key visits, 1 luncheon to identify prospects for global advisory board and yes to national steering committee. Ijede Management Committee says yes to PSU for building new directions.

Internal: Hosting IERD team and Chan guests keeps House hopping and allows for global interchange in collegiums and informal conversations.

Contradiction: Creating story that insures victory for the quarter and next year while being buffeted by circumstances beyond our control. (Wk. 5)*

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

External: Development team secures two booths in two trade fairs for mat and toy sales while Kapini village women's industry secures K 1,100 order. The High Commissioner of Zambia to Canada meets with MP and staff for site visit. Zambia Steel donates two of six blackboards for two preschools, and Roundtable supplies doors and windows for village clinic. Green signal is given by Headmen to open fifth preschool in Diamond of Zambia.

Internal: House does a documentation workshop to prepare for Global Council, and first Roundtable of the quarter includes Copperbelt team.

Contradiction: Guaranteeing to villages that want to start preschools that House will support them in their endeavour, rather than do it for them. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Appointment with the Minister of Social Services and Culture and the Area Section meeting give indices for next bold move in replication. Sr. Agnes arrives to shadow Sr. Ramona and health caretakers program.

Internal: Pat and Robert Coffman arrive home in time for Sir James Lindsay's and Paul Schrijnen's dialogue on the IERD and Kenya authorization.

Contradiction: Maintaining all fronts while accelerating the AALD. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: Village circuit participation increases following Tiriki S. Location Consult. Village leaders visit Ministry of Co-operatives about crop marketing and the Ministry of Agriculture about kitchen garden demonstrations. Three people from each House in Section A gather in Kalwani-Shamalago for Section Meeting.

Internal: House repairs begin with cementing and plastering of a room and kitchen construction as tomatoes are transplanted in garden, and House hosts Section Meeting celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring sub-locations honour commitment to provide accommodation for circuiters. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Location Consult set-up proceeds smoothly as over 2500 villagers attend sub-location meeting to select representatives to attend Location Consult. Gathama-Gatira-Ngamburi villages produce 70 people to complete two-year timeline as part of Muthithi Sub-location planning.

Internal: House prepares for Location Consult and District Commissioner's visit by cleaning and redecoring House including the creation of seven sub-location tracking charts which cover one whole wall.

Contradiction: Having undeveloped communication structures and programme realization modes to care for both villages and circuiters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: House circuits 30 of the project's 155 villages. Authorization is done for impact of two new locations, Wamunyu (36 villages) and settled areas (20 villages). Village Leadership Institutes are completed in Mitaboni (47 villages) with 104 people and Masii (33 villages) with 88 people. Delivery of nursery school building materials to 34 Muputi Location villages is begun.

Internal: 60 HDTI students go on circuits, and House hosts four-person health and gardening training team.

Contradiction: Finding implementaries to do the agricultural training schemes committed to now. (Wk. 5)*

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The Rs. 1, 26,500 (Rupees) in the bank this week plus having two teams at HDTI (Bangalore) and Global Methods Academy (Calcutta) take the full support of the nexus troop force.

Internal: Roundtable with two guests from Chikhale is highlight of the week, a highly motivating event with imported cheese and wine for the occasion, thanks to return of John Burbidge from Australia.

Contradiction: Doing whatever is necessary to unlock the go-ahead on the block-cluster training centres. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Second H.D.A. meeting (four sector) is held at Maliwada with four new faces at the table. New people have new approaches to long-standing contradiction for the cluster. Two *Gram Sahbas* are held in the 232 villages.

Internal: Marathi class is held for extra-nationals and illiterate staff.

Contradiction: Building the context for a community forest programme instead of an individual programme. (Wk. 5)*

External: Team hosts a site visit to Chikhale by the Maharaja of Jodpur. Local guardian and contractor for training centre completes construction schedule before the monsoon, and teams begin repairs on a second primary school building in the Cluster at Beloli village. Internal: After receiving report on Area Check Signals Meeting, House finalizes quarter timeline. On Friday village leader invites House to participate in *Satya Narayana Puja* (special worship associated with Truth and new beginnings).

Contradiction: Reconfiguring into teams that draw forth creativity and push all to limit of corporate responsibility. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE

External: Four cluster farmers meet with Dr. Sapare of Kirloskar Consultants and Canara Bank; and the farmers decide to go ahead with the Wadgar Lift Irrigation Scheme; nearly all local money is in hand. Zagalwadi collects local money for painting; Wadgoan collects money for TV application, and Lohom Youth *Mandal* type registration application. Women's team visits 26 women in preparation for Women's Industry and are surprised in one village to discover that the women have already been saving and want to register their *Mahile Mandal*.

Internal: Ashram is like S.T. Bus, sending colleagues George Knott to Budhoda and Sherod Raut to Vaviharsh and receiving Prabha Bhalerao and Ramesh Jadhav from Chikhale. Ashram experiences the grounding of the song, "*Jagruti*" with the presence of more women in the Ashram. Surprise collegium on ten largest nations of the world gives many new images and reminder of both the gap and the demand to be one globe.

Contradiction: The need to create new images and use methods that enable village people to see that they have everything necessary to take care of the village. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE

External: Nalla Bunding meeting and site survey are held in Maale and Maslewade, recognizing that shortage of cement may slow down scheme and interrupt several quarter projects. Loan surveys are conducted in three villages; some schemes, where loans are readily available, will get quickly underway. In Kalondi, a women's meeting is held and funds are collected for a future society. Maale celebrates Dr. Ambedkar Jayanthi's birthday and earlier in the week has a feast.

Internal: Karune Khamble successfully makes her first witness. Long awaited table arrives; and more survey forms are printed and they are disappearing at an alarming rate.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move on the loan survey as the basis for economic development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA

External: Team collects Rs. 175 for the *Ambar Charkha* shed, attends a Rotary meeting and constructs a urinal. Team visits guardians, sets date for global film show and does a *shramdan* for the Shivaji statue unveiling. Drinking water tank is fixed, and the B.D.O. visits.

Internal: House does quarter planning and a training session on Circle Cluster preparation. John McAdam works with Ashram three days, and George Knott is assigned for three months.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move into the cluster with few troops and little money. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI

External: Twenty new framing/development contacts are made during total of 40 visits. Sondo and Tulana create new strategies to actuate keystones such as roads, electricity and preschools; and signboard repainting gives new face to Tembhurwahi streets and Sondo village. Panveli women decide to send three participants to Tembhurwahi sewing classes and start new vegetable business. Tembhurwahi Gram Panchayat leases sawmill to new resident for a 131% increase in rent.

Internal: Development/Inkind collegium reveals strong bi-metro track-record, and Roundtable study gives new insight into rationality symbol.

Contradiction: Building Ashram and bi-metro strategies that will help in deciding budget priorities. (Wk. 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Inkind fan, tube lights and wiring are secured; Rs.10,001 in hand and Rs.6,000 are committed for advertisements in Sikror brochure. Dutch and Danes both invite major funding proposals. School repair work begins in Bizupor village. Three colleagues indicate willingness to move into Cluster.

Internal: Impromptu celebration for development victories breaks loose during IERD team visits.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in Cluster in midst of state elections, marriage season and minimal finances. (Wk. 5)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Village meeting with two government officials, five bank executives, six executives from a fertilizer company and 90 villagers from Gunjurpalya is highlighted by spontaneous witnesses to ICA's effectiveness in awakening villagers to their own possibilities. Two Sikh villagers sign up for HDTI. Over 60 participants are committed for HDTI, and Rs. 12,000 of inkind is being collected. First contact with a Bangalore company results in immediate gift of Rs. 5000.

Internal: Australia, America, Malaysia, England, Germany, and the states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh are all represented on eight-person HDTI set-up team.

Contradiction: Maintaining vigilance on every front for HDTI set-up when numerous "yesses" tend to lull House into a false sense of security. (Wk. 3)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Team visits 25 schools in four days to confirm registrations for Methods Academy. Next varied programme for Quarter II and Rs.6,000 working [sic]. First meeting of women's guild resulting from Bustee Leader Institute plans regular meetings for methods training.

Internal: In week is highlighted by Global Assignment collegiums and "Pass" school reports for E.G., Nexus team arrives for Methods Academy preparation.

Contradiction: Focussing energies in a single event to make the Methods Academy the event of the year. (Wk.5)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Nexus signal gives a chance to plan programme schedule for Quarter IV and assignments model for Quarter I. First Australian patron's gift for \$3,000 is received for IERD funding maneuver.

Internal: Nexus planning and scheduling ends with great celebration on the roof with real steak and beer after Nexus participates in volleyball game in House compound.

Contradiction: Getting the implementation details behind the big resolve. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Date is set in June for high-level Imaginal Education course with participants from Ministry of Education, each of the Malaysian universities, and other training agencies. Course is to be co-sponsored by INTAN — the government employee training institute. S\$10,000 (Singapore dollars) is received from Chen Foundation in Singapore.

Internal: House watches the outcome of the national elections with avid interest as many advocates retain or move into key political positions.

Contradiction: Waiting out post-election period of settling-in, while anxiety mounts over our visa and government status. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Week of national elections has surprising program momentum as governor signs report on Bubun Kecamatan to Central Government and invites two-hour ICA briefing on work of last three and a half years at Provincial Development Coordination meeting. Program calendar is almost completely filled for May as another plantation company (PNP VII) requests Global Language School and small holder workers methods training. Third Roundtable has heads of university and government departments represented.

Internal: Election Day "files" blitz, the new songbook and inkind victory of six fans gives House new spirit high.

Contradiction: Picking up the momentum with government agencies after the election slow down. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: National elections happen without incident. Soedjai is pleased with team's speech translation and writing, and he intensifies his yes to giving one person a visa for next year to translate correspondence. Metro visits and a visit to Kelapa Dua are wonder-filled events. Global Advisory Board meeting reveals depth interest and willingness to support and further ICA work by Indonesian Foundation founders.

Okinawa circuit highlights role played by Japanese advisors in LENS Symposium recruitment, and Symposium LENS in Taipei opens possibilities of programme consultations, inhouse LENS and HDTP participation. Entire month's accounting for all five nations, both ICA and O:E, is done in one week with computerized system.

Internal: Roundtable study on *Japan, No. 1* occasions reflection on dynamics producing Japan's economic success as they apply to global human development, and collegium on break-looses in the Philippines updates Team in preparation for Putsan (Tiwi) HDP Consult.

Contradiction: Forging depth interchange mechanisms to illuminate global/local victories and struggles, thereby enabling strategic prioritization of regional programmes. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

Internal: House welcomes Ceferino Garay to join again the Project.

Contradiction: Preparing for doctor's visit to distribute medicine. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: The Japan Urban Planning Council commits three LENS for City Planners — the first one is for June. Toppan Printing Company (the world's second largest) donates design work and 3000 new Town Meeting workbooks roll off the presses.

Internal: Management Centrum arrives to discuss ICA legal and financial plans with House and advisors. Elliott gives a stunning collegium on computers and the future. The first public Toyko House Training Center brochure is finished and ready for distribution.

Contradiction: Structuring The Order: Ecumenical life to be attractive to a few of the many disillusioned salaried men of Japan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Yeosu project initiation gets a big push with the start of three-week circuit by David Hutcheons, Min Sung and Kim Sung Hee and with \$15,000 grant from Honam (Union) Oil.

Internal: David Elliot arrives on first Management Centrum visit in over a year.

Contradiction: Putting form on the many new possibilities knocking on the door. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: Children's Day holiday is fully filled with one team hosting a Cluster Youth Corps event of painting village signs and having a ping pong contest. Another team goes to Seoul for mid-quarter adjustments and planning. Plans are made for Cluster's next "Five Bold Moves".

Regional Team holds computer workshop, indicating directions for training and immediate useage.

Winus Roten holds week-long pastoral retreat for priests in Minnesota and as Rayne UMC spends an hour on India HDPs and gives \$800.

Internal: Leila McKay completes teaching contract with signatures so as to release salary of \$4500 for 58 days.

Contradiction: Doing the specific and comprehensive in such a style as to "finely" finish projects in motion and launch the needed new for a victorious year. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Fine working multi-sector team meeting in Lacoochee sets Consult on the path. Week of development launches fund raising for Lacoochee Consultation in Tampa Metro and broadens contact base in Tallahassee Metro.

Internal: Ian raises \$130 from sponsors for crew national races in Dover, Delaware; Terri Ersch, new volunteer, gives new look to office by redecorating with posters from Miami Region "accounts".

Contradiction: Spinning the plates in four metros in one week while insuring momentum in Pasco County. (Wk. 6)*

Contradiction: Broadening participatory yes to participatory approach to Midcrest by Midcrest structures. (Wk. 4)

External: Two workshops facilitated by ICA — Imaginal Education and one on Leadership methods — generate enthusiasm at Annual Parent Involvement Conference of St. Louis Magnet School System. Introductory context to coordination of community schools stimulates excitement in anticipation of five four-hour Leadership Training Labs. Metro core completes *The World Challenge* study and decides to do one more session to pull entire book together in addition to continuing the study sessions with another book.

House holds second session of leadership training with high school youth at Boces, and Team holds third session of Wilton RS-1. House sets up Community LENS in Boonton, New Jersey for Quarter II, 1982-83.

Internal: House lease celebration puts new significance to work on new facility.

Contradiction: Using momentum present in Area to move the Area Training Center towards completion. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Over 300 participate in six Community LENS with Charleston Housing Authority, held simultaneously during Week 12, following fine weekend of LENS pedagogy (35 around table). Assembly of communities celebrates cluster experiment, names seven keystones for first 90 days of implementation and breaks loose clean-up day in Orchard Manor that gets local front-page news coverage with collection of 14,000 pounds of trash. Eighty-eight people from cluster communities participate in ten-day Community Leadership Training Event.

Internal: Regional Team celebrates completion of first three phases of four-phase (two-year) West Virginia Cluster Experiment with Friday night dinner at Tequila Junction and Saturday night dinner at Max's Allegheny Tavern and three hours of stomping on the waters of the three rivers on board the Gateway Clipper Fleet's party liner.

Contradiction: Maintaining one corporate thrust in the midst of being dispersed. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Imaginal Education courses in Albany and Buffalo train Regional Team and address lives of new participants. Workshop with Administrative Boards of five Methodist churches plans celebration of 175 years of Methodism in Troy.

Internal: Kaye Hayes' visit immerses Regional Team in the style of the pedagogue, and House Church at the Schneiders symbolizes presence of House in the Buffalo Metro.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on advantages and opportunities created by courses. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Colleagues from three metros and representing four sectors gather for HD-I course at Fernbrook Conference Center. Pedagogues for HD-I bring theoretic expertise backed by years of exciting work in Human Development in both villages and the urban. Metro Research Nights in Harrisburg and Philadelphia demonstrate that there is a core ready for an HDZ which includes their community.

Internal: *The World Challenge* reading on use of computers in villages inspires heated discussion on village readiness for computers in the near future.

Contradiction: Building a realistic plan of the results of Dialogue Two. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Petersburg core holds tactical review and maneuver writing session. Appointment with school superintendent results in program potential with city-wide public school staff. Over Week II 18 people participate in supervisors course.

Internal: House celebrates Nancy Vosler's Masters Degree and Nancy Eggert's return to Region after two and a half week sojourn at Fukuoka House in Area Tokyo.

Contradiction: Focusing the *now* through grounded implementaries in the midst of intense eventfulness. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Dartmouth student Steve Knowlton is confirmed for three-month volunteer term in Azpitia. Planning forum and maneuver building with leadership of East Bridgewater UMC enables refinement of the format and third opportunity for leadership role for Donna Costa. Paul Clements leads Regional Team collegium on Order future, while House creates 11 May maneuvers and all participate in Starks Work Day on Week II.

Internal: House sends representative to funeral of Dick Stanley's mother in New Hampshire and participates in Cambodian New Year's celebration in Providence, Rhode Island.

Contradiction: Creating regional report for 1981-82 that honors the complexity of regional team action and indicates the emerging strategic directions. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: STARKS

External: Starks residents welcome 19 from Massachusetts for third May Saturday workday for completion of interior door and firewall, indoor earth toilet, exterior wall tarpapering, and participation in the Starks school fair. New owner for Sassafras store is located so that business can go on uninterrupted. Trip to Bangor is very productive as possibilities emerge from four calls for LENS funding, Starks Enterprises Corporation funding, a university lecture series, and the Individual and Family course.

Internal: House is impacted by *The World Challenge study on knowledge as the new resource and by burial service for Starks colleague Bud Hayden.*

Contradiction: *Fighting the unbelief that something is going to win in the tenant arena.* (Wk. 6)*

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Conversations with old Community Forum participants from four to five years ago in Brome and Riviere des Prairies reveal that catalysis and awakenment are major gifts brought by Forums which then lead in turn to new community involvement and new project initiatives, symbolized for both communities in community centres. Five nights in a row, stake meetings are held in *Habitations Jeanne Mance* which reveal the foundational challenge to the people of daring to create enough order and stability to maintain a community garden in the middle of inner city Montreal.

Internal: House sends out Marguerite's parents with countless stories to Saskatchewan after they participate in a Forum documentation visit, internal life structures, a trip to the old family house in Quebec City and visits with *Habitations Jeanne Mance* residents.

Contradiction: Covering two major fronts at the same time. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Regional Team hosts congregation dinner for Mike and Bronwyn with profound conversation on marriage combined with interchange of activities.

Internal: House moves office to complete ground floor rehabilitation and celebrates Monique Dion's birthday at House Church.

Contradiction: Intentionalizing the training and spirit life of the Regional Team. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Forty new people participate in three core courses during the week-long Atlantic Potential Academy. Kaye Hayes, Bob Booher and Ottawa R.E.P. join the faculty for the week. Twenty-five programme possibilities emerge from participants' comments.

Internal: R.E.P. House shifts location to Memromcook [sic] for the Atlantic Potential Academy; and during concluding celebration, team sings spring love songs to the "beaus" and "belles" of Hotel Beasejour.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum going through myriad of possibilities and discerning new position of advantages after a break-through Academy. (Wk. 4)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY

External: Team makes trek to Chilapa in the state of Guerrero to visit village projects staffed by a team of Religious, and returns with new insights on permeation in a rural project. Key couple in San Camilo takes on the recruitment task for the Community LENS seminar. Augustinian Fathers contribute 25,000 pesos (US \$500) to programme funds.

Internal: Permeation celebration with students from computer course with Multibanco Comermex includes visit to the Aztec pyramids and retelling ancient story of Mexico City.

Contradiction: Creating the Mexican story for the IERD in India and upcoming framing trek to Mexico that will quickly mature a budding public/private frame. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: Continued meetings with IDB on setting up the irrigation project offer possible early initiation of construction.

Internal: Visit of Hahn and Kitney from Chicago offers exchange of missional stories and collegial participation in Conacoste guild meetings.

Contradiction: Finding that unclarity on the next steps for other programs becomes concern as final breakthrough on irrigation nears. (Wk. 1)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: The 75 guild leaders from the 16 villages at the Cluster Leaders Meeting create immediate targets for each of the five guilds. Port Antonio Metro circuit includes visit to Claverty Cottage, and University of Southern Florida makes site visit to Woburn Lawn. Rotary luncheon at the U.S. Ambassador's table produces his comment of "the methods being used in Woburn Lawn are needed across all of Jamaica"; and the manager of the Private Sector Organization of Jamaica agrees to set up a private sector committee on Cluster investments and markets. IDB progress report and Price-Waterhouse audit on Woburn Lawn Co-op are submitted to IDB in Kingston.

Internal: House sends out Linda Barnes after Management trek and Kristin Roe after four-month sojourn. Fred gets a two-year visa for Jamaica.

Contradiction: Building the movement in Jamaica while still designing the form. (Wk. 4)*

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Two solid Community Forums in the valley signal receptivity and potential for further programming. Donation of typewriters creates possibility of Training Center typing class. Completion of government financial accountability signifies viability of local management systems.

Internal: House and community receive Jose and Zenaida Armas and family and send Jim Newkirk to cluster consult in Barlovento.

Contradiction: Confirming registrations and financial undergirding for HDTs. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: The first mobilization treks to New Nucleo villages are smashing success. La Boca village has 40 at guild and stake meetings. House plaques start to appear all over villages. INAGRO (Government Agricultural Agency) assigns full-time Agricultural Instructor to the Nucleo.

Internal: Jon Jenkins' enlivening presence merits a "Non Copenhagen" send out.

Contradiction: Keeping ahead of selves on manuals, treks and government delivery of basic services. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Preparation for HDTs includes second big work day (this one in the rain) and delivery of many inkind materials and supply items. A fine *Mesa Redonda* (Roundtable) in the village, led entirely by the villagers, is a highlight of the week.

Internal: Christopher and Martin Pesek enrich the Area with their presence in Sol and Santiago, including a fine multi-cultural *Mesa Redonda* in Santiago.

Contradiction: Appropriating the fear and fascination while last countdown for HDTs begins. (Wk. 5)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: A doctor shows up at Bracana community festival as the fiance of the local bank manager's daughter (the manager was representing the bank at the festival) and agrees to do health portion of the project, allowing immediate visible results in a major arena. Backlog of administrative issues are handled including hiring an accountant for ICA books and formalizing new inkind ICA office in Rio at Brasox (a subsidiary of British Oxygen) complete with private office, telex, phones, secretaries, xeroxing and answering service.

Internal: *Brasil futebol* (soccer) team whips Portugal 3 to 1 as excitement mounts for World Cup being held in Spain in July.

Contradiction: Getting the whole plan in focus for everyone, community, ICA and municipal team. (Wk. 5)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that a LENS held in Jakarta brings in US \$6,000 and a second LENS is scheduled there for May. Rs.1,000,000 (rupees) is received from Greeves Cotton after writing a report on the Kendur Project. An old friend of Sir James Lindsay gives Rs.5000 (rupees) and wants to help on IERD. The first Australian patron's gift of \$3000 for IERD funding is received and Area Suva raises \$1,000 for Tonga GFC (Kuala Lumpur Nexus). A Dutch Embassy wants to fund two clusters as soon as the proposals are completed and submitted to them (Bombay Nexus). The key contradiction lies in the arena of turning the cash squirt into a gusher when the world thinks there is a recession on.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Kuala Lumpur check signals meeting gives opportunity to plan July recruitment and regional research. Bombay reports sending one team to Calcutta Methods Academy to write curriculum and writing a brief on the Faridabad HDZ. The *IMAGE* on Motivity and the Human Factor is in final edit stage. The 35th Global Academy prepares for last week — Individual and Family course and the Odyssey. Kuala Lumpur reports invitation to submit paper on Sungai Lui to Prime Minister's Committee on Modernization of the Agricultural Sector. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the comprehensive in the midst of on-going centrum functions, course assignments, and July Council prep.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports from Bombay that HDTI is set up in conjunction with the whole Sub-continent and Bombay LENS brochure is redone. In Kuala Lumpur, nexus check signals meeting creates Quarter IV plan and prepares marketing packets for all regions in South SEAPAC. In Chicago, North American faculty pool data is finally entered into computer, and assignment rationale for Phase One assignments in July is completed. In Bombay, study for the Gold paper allows all to reflect on what it takes to prepare an exposition. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting the models in hand that will enable financial systems in the region and the nexus for Quarters IV and I.

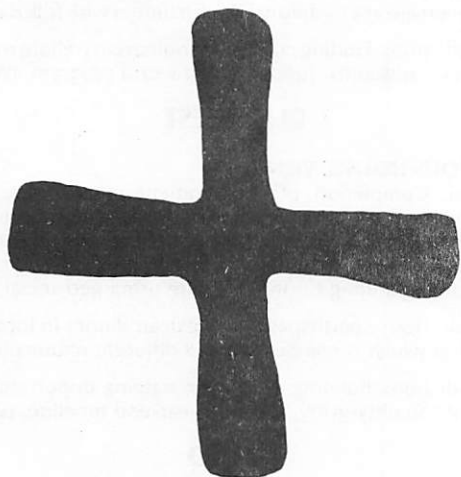
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic keeps everyone and washing machine busy as Jim Kelly and Rose Worden come and go for LENS. Father Ilidio and others from Portugal visit during week II, Bill, Luz Marina and Portuguese colleagues pass through from Formation Fortnight to Lamego, and House sends out Maria de Fry to Cluster Consult in Portugal, as Patricia Allan secures additional job teaching English to staff of the Ministry of Education.

Contradiction: Fitting together June programme components before time runs out in a busy May. (Wk. 4)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Leonard Sizer represents House in Area Media Action Task Force, and the circuit of that team finds colleagues ready to respond with their support and advice. Invitations are mailed out for a colleague and guardian dinner/house warming as part of Area Council. New sojourner arrives in time to carry forward preparations for ICA booth at Outdoor Venture Day sponsored by local youth radio station.

Internal: First week in new facility with boxes and odd furniture stacked in every corner proves chaotic with two staff on the road and four with full-time employment, but all is celebrated with a great sunny Saturday in Canterbury which provides an encounter with an age when life did not move with such speed.

Contradiction: Seeing the unclarity in the intent to create a new House. (Wk. 6)

Internal: House hosts and sends out Media Task Force Team, as delight, giggles and poetry mark first Roundtable of the quarter.

Contradiction: Ensuring that External Mission succeeds with power in the midst of long-term brooding on Internal Life. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Three days of Community LENS calls open door to Asian community in Cardiff and introduce ICA to voluntary and public sector groups. Swansea circuit visits Welsh Industrial Fair and five Tai'rgwarth people re Friendly [sic] Society.

Internal: House participates in Christian Aid Fete and austerity Lunch with four ecumenical organizations.

Contradiction: Keeping even emphasis on four strategic objectives. (Wk. 7)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Sojourner translates LENS participant manual for June weekend. ICA president invites six advisors to June financial strategy meeting. Team makes 13 contacts with acquaintances from the Rennes Region's GCF campaign.

Internal: Collegium on House space and Development planning meeting with M. Nani, Helen Williams and Dominique Mathiot reveal care for the future.

Contradiction: Creating the appropriate servant role of the ICA in France. (Wk. 7)*

* NOTE: The * indicates the first printing of a new report.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Formation Fortnight ends. Having hosted 102 participants, Nexus moves into Lamego Consult and IERD preparation without missing a beat.

Internal: Nexus moves residence and Centrum offices to new centre; planning for rest of year is done in Week 1 of Week 4, and week ends with celebration and dancing into rest of year.

Contradiction: Getting through the paralysis of "no money" to building a plan for the next six months. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**FRANKFURT****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Six people from the Region attend Formation Fortnight in Brussels, including three from Ludwigshafen core. Bishop of Lamego spends the night at the House en route from appointment with Miserior, Catholic funding agency, and House prepares a real Bishop's room.

Internal: Yvonne goes to IERD meeting in London and Katherine goes to staff LENS on the St. Josse community and for the Fortnight. New job schedule is irregular, but flexible, giving needed Day 1 time.

Contradiction: Capturing and releasing this year's victory and the necessary historical residue critical for future of the Movement in Germany together with implementing survival tactics in the financial arena. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Regional Team meeting in Elst to plan full year calendar of events and check signals on upcoming Board Meeting demonstrates a style of healthy tensional consensus making and creates valuable input for Area Council in Frankfurt the next day.

Internal: House opens doors of the Wayside Inn and welcomes Kathleen Bryant, Denver colleague on her way to Hellsinki, hosts three prospective volunteers and welcomes Dutch colleague to *World Challenge* study night and regional collegium, the following morning, on "Theoretics of Social Change".

Contradiction: Being the catalytic presence while trying to grasp what is the new that has been catalysed. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Ascension Day as a national holiday occasions three-pronged area event consisting of research module, methods flea market, and Area Council. Berlin prepares translated *Methods Manual*.

Internal: House takes evaluation of Regional Team and creates 1981-82 report as foundation for next year's planning and invention of new Berlin story.

Contradiction: Creating an imaginal quarter plan that cares for two regions and can be carried out by a permeator in a one-person House. (Wk. 7)*

ROME**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

External: A Guestnight series of Leadership Methods Mini-modules is catalyzing interest in corporate methods; two requests for training come in after the second session. Team receives development contribution of Lire 1,440,000. A LENS call at Esso results in scheduling a June presentation with two department heads.

Internal: The new look of the renovated kitchen builds momentum for the rest of the corporate space face lift, and House sends Dan Tuecke to Nigeria for three weeks.

Contradiction: Racing to finish quarter's maneuvers before global demands pull troops away for councils. (Wk. 6)*

STOCKHOLM**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN**

External: Bjarne Nielsen of "Planetary Initiative" visits House and requests workshop methods training and proposes a further meeting with his organization to develop a suitable forum construct. Norad phones to announce a 500,000 kroner (US\$85,000) grant for ICA India. Marianne Baasch returns from Brussels Fortnight and pledges three days per week to House.

Internal: Whole house shows its colours when forced to speak local language at a traditional Danish dinner with folk dancing.

Contradiction: Finding crack in Scandinavian welfare mindset to release substantial funds for first world program. (Wk. 5)

BUDAPEST**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA**

External: Completion of development circuit nets \$1550. Maneuver planning is done for continuing development and integrated circuiting. Roundtable participants engage in lively muse on an excerpt from "*The World Challenge*" and engage in practical gridding during dialogue using geo-social grid.

Internal: House participates in Mexican dinner in local congregation which is composed of 19 different nationalities.

Contradiction: Building solid team training opportunities in midst of the nitty-gritty, meeting year-end timeline. (Wk. 6)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA****ABIDJAN****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN**

External: Sir James Lindsay and Paul Schrijnen arrive for IERD Global Advisory Board visits to INADES (African Institute for Socio-Economic Development), to the Indian Ambassador, and to Philips Petroleum. Visit to Dutch Embassy finds a possible immediate contribution to the Cluster.

Internal: Collegium by Sir James on the IERD "macro-picture" is refreshing and helpful to everyone.

Contradiction: Financing participation in the African Assembly. (Wk. 6)*

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: N 1250 (US \$1875) and three dozen new pairs of shoes arrive from development blitz; the highlight is delivery of two donations to the House, one by guardian Alex Sharta during his participation in the Rafos' send out. African Assembly on Local Development (AALD) is launched with recruitment team visiting Ajegunle, one of the most remote and poorly cared-for parts of Lagos. One hundred slides are expected in Nairobi, fresh from processing by a colleague in Amsterdam, for the Nigeria AALD presentation.

Internal: Dan Tuecke arrives for a month of maneuvers on development, immigration, and AALD recruitment in time to meet Rebecca Nichols on her way into Nigeria from 10-day visit to Abijan.

Contradiction: Focusing attention on events which need to be re-scheduled in order not to lose their potential for the future mission. (Wk. 6)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Development team secures two booths in two trade fairs for mat and toy sales while Kapini village women's industry secures K 1,100 order. The High Commissioner of Zambia to Canada meets with MP and staff for site visit. Zambia Steel donates two of six blackboards for two preschools, and Roundtable supplies doors and windows for village clinic. Green signal is given by Headmen to open fifth preschool in Diamond of Zambia.

Internal: House does a documentation workshop to prepare for Global Council, and first Roundtable of the quarter includes Copperbelt team.

Contradiction: Guaranteeing to villages that want to start preschools that House will support them in their endeavour, rather than do it for them. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Two-week AALD (African Assembly on Local Development) count down is accelerated with Week II PSU and report of nine coming from Ghana. The Matha sub-location consult, Village Leadership Institute (VII) in El Dume, Mitaboni officers LENS, final set-up of two locations to complete central division impact (222 villages), and 108 Mitaboni leaders meeting to plan development around their villages concretize programmatic thrust. Development victories include British American Tobacco gift of K20,000, NORAD II approval of total grant request, and hosting Ford Foundation and Swedish Cooperative Centre evaluation teams.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic comes into full play as 55 HDTI graduates travel to new assignments, Evelyn Philbrook and Linda Alton depart for July Prep Task Force in Chicago and House staff are in and out on LENS, development treks, site visits, evaluations, Zambia foray, and NVM programmes.

Contradiction: Shifting gears to AALD preparation while keeping on top of programmatic thrusts. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAWANGWARE — KABIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI — SHAMALAGO

External: Village circuit participation increases following Tiriki S. Location Consult. Village leaders visit Ministry of Co-operatives about crop marketing and the Ministry of Agriculture about kitchen garden demonstrations. Three people from each House in Section A gather in Kalwani-Shamalago for Section Meeting.

Internal: House repairs begin with cementing and plastering of a room and kitchen construction as tomatoes are transplanted in garden, and House hosts Section Meeting celebration.

Contradiction: Ensuring sub-locations honour commitment to provide accommodation for circuiters. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: Location Consult set-up proceeds smoothly as over 2500 villagers attend sub-location meeting to select representatives to attend Location Consult. Gathama-Gatira-Ngamburi villages produce 70 people to complete two-year timeline as part of Muthithi Sub-location planning.

Internal: House prepares for Location Consult and District Commissioner's visit by cleaning and redecoring House including the creation of seven sub-location tracking charts which cover one whole wall.

Contradiction: Having undeveloped communication structures and programme realization modes to care for both villages and circuiters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: Eleventh cluster project in the region is launched with consult in Matha Sublocation, Machakos District. Ford Foundation sends team to visit circuits in Masii Location. Local Government Officers LENS is held for 23 from Mitaboni Location.

Internal: Eight more are assigned to Regional House out of the tenth completed HDTI.

Contradiction: Putting necessary priority on training for next quarter's circuit programmes which will involve assigning one ICA staff and a group of village leaders to each sublocation cluster. (Wk. 7)*

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Nexus troops cover continent with a presence in every region where work is going on. The NORAD grant releases an aura of well-being across the whole House, like rain on desert sand.

Internal: *Shramdan* to paint Phase I room and to make toys brings great week in Phase I Summer Programme to triumphant conclusion.

Contradiction: Discerning the necessary tactics to ensure the success of all current programmes. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA

External: Second H.D.A. meeting (four sector) is held at Maliwada with four new faces at the table. New people have new approaches to long-standing contradiction for the cluster. Two *Gram Sahbas* are held in the 232 villages.

Internal: Marathi class is held for extra-nationals and illiterate staff.

Contradiction: Building the context for a community forest programme instead of an individual programme. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — CHIKHALE

External: Team hosts a site visit to Chikhale by the Maharaja of Jodpur. Local guardian and contractor for training centre completes construction schedule before the monsoon, and teams begins repairs on a second primary school building in the Cluster at Beloli village. Another eight *Gram Sahbas* are completed during the week.

Internal: After receiving report on Area Check Signals Meeting, House finalizes quarter timeline. On Friday village leader invites House to participate in *Satya Narayana Puja* (special worship associated with Truth and new beginnings).

Contradiction: Reconfiguring into teams that draw forth creativity and push all to limit of corporate responsibility. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — VAVIHARSH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — JAWALE

External: Four cluster farmers meet with Dr. Sapare of Kirloskar Consultants and Canara Bank; and the farmers decide to go ahead with the Wadgar Lift Irrigation Scheme; nearly all local money is in hand. Zagalwadi collects local money for painting; Wadgoan collects money for TV application, and Lohom Youth *Mandal* type registration application. Women's team visits 26 women in preparation for Women's Industry and are surprised in one village to discover that the women have already been saving and want to register their *Mahile Mandal*.

Internal: Ashram is like S.T. Bus, sending colleagues George Knott to Budhoda and Sherod Raut to Vaviharsh and receiving Prabha Bhalerao and Ramesh Jadhav from Chikhale. Ashram experiences the grounding of the song, "*Jagruti*" with the presence of more women in the Ashram. Surprise collegium on ten largest nations of the world gives many new images and reminder of both the gap and the demand to be one globe.

Contradiction: The need to create new images and use methods that enable village people to see that they have everything necessary to take care of the village. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — MAALE

External: Nalla Bunding meeting and site survey are held in Maale and Maslewade, recognizing that shortage of cement may slow down scheme and interrupt several quarter projects. Loan surveys are conducted in three villages; some schemes, where loans are readily available, will get quickly underway. In Kalondi, a women's meeting is held and funds are collected for a future society. Maale celebrates Dr. Ambedkar Jayanthi's birthday and earlier in the week has a feast.

Internal: Karune Khamble successfully makes her first witness. Long awaited table arrives; and more survey forms are printed and they are disappearing at an alarming rate.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move on the loan survey as the basis for economic development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE — BUDHODA

External: Team collects Rs. 175 for the *Ambar Charkha* shed, attends a Rotary meeting and constructs a urinal. Team visits guardians, sets date for global film show and does a *shramdan* for the Shivaji statue unveiling. Drinking water tank is fixed, and the B.D.O. visits.

Internal: House does quarter planning and a training session on Circle Cluster preparation. John McAdam works with Ashram three days, and George Knott is assigned for three months.

Contradiction: Seeing how to move into the cluster with few troops and little money. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — SEVAGRAM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — TEMBHURWAHI

External: During 40 visits, 20 new framing/development contacts are made. Sondo and Tulana create new strategies to actuate keystones such as roads, electricity and preschools; and signboard repainting gives new face to Tembhurwahi streets and Sondo village. Panveli women decide to send three participants to Tembhurwahi sewing classes and start new vegetable business. Tembhurwahi Gram Panchayat leases sawmill to new resident for a 131% increase in rent.

Internal: Development/Inkind collegium reveals strong bi-metro track-record, and Roundtable study gives new insight into rationality symbol.

Contradiction: Building Ashram and bi-metro strategies that will help in deciding budget priorities. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Rupees 37 lakhs (US\$400,000) proposal for three years for Faridabad cluster is requested by and submitted to Royal Netherlands Embassy, and Rs.8,000 are in-hand for week from companies. Quality printing is secured at cost for Sikror brochure, contacts are made for cluster with electricity engineer, and local book branch manager visits. As unseasonal rain destroys much of harvest, agriculture programmes become focus of concern. Regional women's team makes initial visit to Arskom, and programme center brightens up with new paint.

Internal: Nelson arrives from Bombay to write Faridabad proposal, and Grevtge [sic] and Mr. Dethe arrive to begin IERD research.

Contradiction: Linking Regional Team in long-term practical engagement. (Wk. 6)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: First ever Area Madras HDTI is launched with powerful opening presided over by two village panchayat chairmen. Local village high school is host to HDTI (near Bangalore city), and the powerful mix of 43 villagers, social workers and ICA staff is addressed by life witness of a local farmer who gives the Cooperative Agriculture lecture. Six strong and articulate women from village and social work department are already demonstrating "the south is different".

Internal: Old hands Harry Anthic and A. M. Joseph join the faculties of the HDTI and Calcutta Method's Academy, and inkind tops Rs.25,000 (rupees) in preparation for HDTI.

Contradiction: Saying yes to image shifts that happen to faculty as well as to participants. (Wk. 6)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Team visits 25 schools in four days to confirm registrations for Methods Academy. Next varied programme for Quarter II and Rs.6,000 are working. First meeting of women's guild resulting from Bustee Leader Institute plans regular meetings for methods training.

Internal: In week highlighted by Global Assignment collegiums and "Pass" school reports for E.G., Nexus team arrives for Methods Academy preparation.

Contradiction: Focussing energies in a single event to make the Methods Academy the event of the year. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR NEXUS

External: Nexus signal gives a chance to plan programme schedule for Quarter IV and assignments model for Quarter I. First Australian patron's gift for \$3,000 is received for IERD funding maneuver.

Internal: Nexus planning and scheduling ends with great celebration on the roof with real steak and beer after Nexus participates in volleyball game in House compound.

Contradiction: Getting the implementation details behind the big resolve. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Dato Abdullah Ali, guardian and IERD Global Advisory Board member, offers to assist in finding IERD National Chairman, and immediately follows up by making appointments with three very prominent Malaysians. Documentation of all Community Forums done during Sungai Lui Extension—Phase II is completed with the binding of all community documents into a reference booklet. Brochure for Imaginal Education course in June is completed.

Internal: House sends out Siti binte Haji Adul Karim, a long-time colleague from Sungai Lui, to Medan to be married to a young man she met in the Bubun HDTS.

Contradiction: Finding ways to juggle fiscal and human resources creatively to enable continued programme: presence, while fulfilling immigration requirements by: periodically being out of the country. (Wk. 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Week of programs with the local private sector swirls as three two-hour leadership methods modules are held with banks. The first all-day LENS Pedagogy session (LENS Methods I) focuses on team workshops with three provincial government agencies, one university and one business represented, including Tanjung Pura Kecamatan (District) Demonstration head of the health department.

Internal: Collegiums provide deep reflection on openings in central government visits and local implications, and doing the journey charts and case studies intentionalize House care for individuals and institutional relationships.

Contradiction: Using all resources most effectively from Kacamatan (district) Demonstration and possible Regional Team engagement. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: National elections happen without incident. Soedjai is pleased with team's speech translation and writing, and he intensifies his yes to giving one person a visa for next year to translate correspondence. Metro visits and a visit to Kelapa Dua are wonder-filled events. Global Advisory Board meeting reveals depth interest and willingness to support and further ICA work by Indonesian Foundation founders.

Internal: House creates new team names — *Garuda* for the E.G. and *Bayu* and *Indra* for the adults — and celebrates end of LENS setup blitz at a Mexican restaurant and with a video viewing of *The African Queen* movie.

Contradiction: Deciding powerful theme for week to enable orchestration of time and engagement of troops. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: After national election quiet presence in Bontoa — with villagers lining the soccer field to vote — Team hits the road with one-day consultation at Tonasa Cement Company and request to submit consultancy proposal; with a one-hour Village Forum under the trees in neighboring sub-district as guests of rural development; and with first meeting with new assistant to the Governor who is very interested in Human Development.

Internal: Joseph McCabe's third birthday on election day brings in friends from Bontoa for cake and songs, and Saturday night chicken celebration is initial send-out for Fumiyo.

Contradiction: Scheduling the quarter victories before the fasting month begins. (Wk. 6)*

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Nexus reports from participation in four regions indicate excited interest in the HDTP, Taipei, and possibility of funding for SEAPAC following Ford Foundation site visit to Sudtonggan. Unexpected gift of HK\$1,000 comes from a newly married couple who wanted to share their wedding gifts with some worth-while enterprise.

Internal: House guests include Robertson Wong, local colleague, and friend with slides from Mainland China and London volunteer Caroline Studholme.

Contradiction: Ensuring victory for the year while forging ahead on key advantages toward next year. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: A major breakthrough with first attempt to market new package of programs in Hong Kong gains response of three program requests! New office space emerges as one wall is torn down and file cabinets are painted. A celebrative week in Nam Wai with one wedding and a village house-warming provides large village participation and lots of delicious local Chinese cuisine.

Internal: Renting a new piano for self-support venture produces side event of a Ballard family concert during Roundtable interlude.

Contradiction: Seeing that requests for new programs demand the creation of models back-up and new pedagogy for doing the programs. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: HDTP (Human Development Training Program) recruitment visits are initiated with Chinese Culture University and a Catholic sister in Taipei, while mass mailing goes out to about 200 organizations in Taiwan. President of Taiwan Polypropylene confirms the company's continuing support as a major sponsor. LENS marketing yields positive response from Jacobsen Van de Berg and Singer for in-house consults in August and November, respectively.

Internal: House creates task team assignment configuration organized around HDTP, LENS marketing and development.

Contradiction: Determining where focus needs to be in each of the next six weeks for pulling off comprehensive implementation of HDTP, June 20 to July 8. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Mountain Cluster Preschool has closing exercises with 33 graduates. L.H.D.P. receives six boxes of medicine and clinic supplies from International Medical Assistance Canada. Carmen Coop Store does inventory and holds members' meeting.

Internal: House welcomes Ceferino Garay to Project again.

Contradiction: Preparing for doctor's visit to distribute medicine. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: The Japan Urban Planning Council commits three LENS for City Planners — the first one is for June. Toppan Printing Company (the world's second largest) donates design work and 3000 new Town Meeting workbooks roll off the presses.

Internal: Management Centrum arrives to discuss ICA legal and financial plans with House and advisors. Elliott gives a stunning collegium on computers and the future. The first public Toyko House Training Center brochure is finished and ready for distribution.

Contradiction: Structuring The Order: Ecumenical life to be attractive to a few of the many disillusioned salaried men of Japan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The Dutch Embassy comes through with \$5,000 for the Cheong Won Cluster. New possibilities emerge from the participation of Diane Greenwald and Phyllis Hockley in a UNICEF planning workshop.

Internal: Permeation celebration with students from computer course with Multibanco Comermex includes visit to the Aztec pyramids and retelling ancient story of Mexico City.

Contradiction: Creating the Mexican story for the IERD in India and upcoming framing trek to Mexico that will quickly mature a budding public/private frame. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: The grand advance in the project agricultural service program takes place this week with three long-awaited events. First, the governor, mayor, BID representative, members of two government cooperative institutions, national press, and project guardians attend celebration of the legal constitution of the cooperative with 23 members having been associated and having paid their investment deposit. Second, the cooperative agricultural offices are established and furnished to receive their first visit of a vegetable-freezing firm representative who expresses interest in contracting all of the cooperative's future production. Third, the emergency phone call arrives with news from Washington of the approval of construction contracts which will provide for irrigation services to some 115 cooperatives members.

Internal: House celebrates Juana Neriquita's birthday with two roasted pigs and 100 guests, making a total of 200 guests who are served meals in one week between Juana's birthday and celebration of the constitution of the cooperative.

Contradiction: Pulling all ends together to begin construction on the other side of the approval of irrigation contracts. (Wk. 6)*

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: Development team makes 14 calls on national and international, public and private agencies with good short-range and medium-term funding potential. Team and ICA Board set-up Sir James Lindsay's upcoming visit by contacting the office of the Prime Minister through the Minister of Youth and Kings House for the Governor-General as well as the British High Commission. Cluster coordination and actuation continues with distribution of *VOICE* and white-wash to each village and a concert in Mt. Vernon. Management team spends four days working with IDB, NCB and Woburn Co-op to facilitate the flow of monies.

Internal: House fasts on behalf of the world and then feasts with great celebration at end of week.

Contradiction: Preparing Woburn Lawn's fourth year anniversary celebration while creating models for next two years of Cluster actuation and the necessary practical partnerships required with other three sectors. (Wk. 6)*

External: Two solid Community Forums in the valley signal receptivity and potential for further programming. Donation of typewriters creates possibility of Training Center typing class. Completion of government financial accountability signifies viability of local management systems.

Internal: House and community receive Jose and Zenaida Armas and family and send Jim Newkirk to cluster consult in Barlovento;

Contradiction: Confirming registrations and financial undergirding for HDTS. (Wk. 1)

External: The first mobilization treks to New *Nucleo* villages are smashing success. La Boca village has 40 at guild and stake meetings. House plaques start to appear all over villages. INAGRO (Government Agricultural Agency) assigns full-time Agricultural Instructor to the *Nucleo*.

Internal: Jon Jenkins' enlivening presence merits a "Non *Copenragen*" send out.

Contradiction: Keeping ahead of selves on manuals, treks and government delivery of basic services. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Preparation for HDTs includes second big work day (this one in the rain) and delivery of many in-kind materials and supply items. A fine *Mesa Redonda* (Roundtable) in the village, led entirely by the villagers, is a highlight of the week.

Internal: Christopher and Martin Pesek enrich the Area with their presence in Sol and Santiago, including a fine multi-cultural *Mesa Redonda* in Santiago.

Contradiction: Appropriating the fear and fascination while last countdown for HDTs begins. (Wk. 5)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: House celebrates arrival of first installment of Ford Foundation grant. The doctor hired for the project, one day a week, attends 40 patients on his first visit and in-kind medicines. Visit to a university uncovers the possibility of bringing secondary school education to Bracana and Tatus.

Internal: An unexpected visit from Canadian Don Anderson is an occasion for lunch out and English conversation.

Contradiction: Identifying top priorities as House enters the June-July funnel. (Wk. 6)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports IERD victories in recruiting the Global Advisory Board, now 59 people representing 21 nations; Miss Anstee, one of three deputy secretaries under the UN Secretary General, and Cyrus Vance agree to be on the Board. Kuala Lumpur reports receiving \$1000 from a Melbourne advisor, and a \$6000 LENS is scheduled and held within two weeks in Jakarta. Hong Kong reports that a representative for S.E. Asia Ford Foundation visits Mactan. Bombay reports NORAD confirms decision to make grant of Rs.745,661 (US\$84,700) as Bangalore circuit gathers Rs.21,290 in hand; and Dutch proposal for Rs.3,652,100 is written and submitted in five days at request of Dutch Government. Regional Teams set up framing visits for Lady Peggy, who begins her two-week IERD visit in North America. The key contradiction lies in the arena of doing battle with national mindsets of fear relative to the economic future.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that preparation for July '82 includes a series of collegiums on research, constructs and procedures in Kuala Lumpur, a list of new Journal quotes in Hong Kong and an HDZ Practicum in Vaviharsh. Key training programs complete the year as the 35th Global Academy graduates 42, the Taipei HDTF gears up for Week 11, and the Calcutta Methods Academy is prepared for school teachers. Discerning the edge of formation programs intensifies participation in training and July program recruitment. The key contradiction lies in the arena of completing the practical research and documentation that will inform strategies for next year by July.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that HDTI commences in Bangalore with all faculty in place. In Region Hong Kong, ten programmes are now in "working" category following two-week programme push. In Kuala Lumpur, follow-up call to company which held LENS two years ago reveals group requesting methods training courses as soon as possible. Luncheon with guardian Frank Richards opens way to use luncheon meetings with key people for program presentations, and LENS with management level of Nursing Division at Charity Hospital opens way to program presentation with Medical Division. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning the situation only out of intuition, rather than using both hard data and intuition, and recognizing the one thrust of the plethora of diverse activities.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that computer message on Hong Kong's new TS-R 80 II to Chicago Nexus prepares way for satellite communication from Hong Kong to July Task Force. Computers around the various nexi herald the efficiency in analysis of House's financial conditions and financial statements. Breakthroughs seen in positive trends of Canadian self-support and continued operations with tight cash flow push toward long-range strategies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of having the chastity to keep working when worn out and tired of the same routine day after day.
