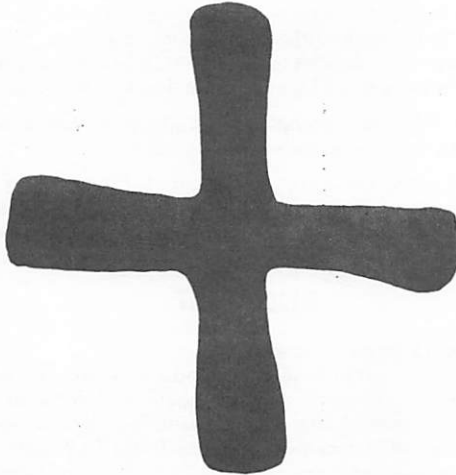

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: Braganca Foro training begins with two from Lamego villages in attendance. Support from Castro Daire district arrives in the form of money for gasoline trips to villages. Ferreiros village holds implementation meeting and decides to do own soil testing as the first step toward agricultural assistance. The President of the Camara comes to supper at the ICA House. Trip to Vila Real with visits to the university president and regional agriculture extension office bring first concrete implementation of village agricultural programs in the form of extension visits, sheep lectures, slide presentations and agricultural module teachers for HDTI.

Internal: English class at winery results in the use of a telex system for ICA. Paul and Branca leave for Braganca Encontros the same day that guests arrive from three towns for Roundtable

Contradiction: Making leaders' meeting an active participatory happening. (Weeks 4,5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: IERD translations are printed as Ariza set is prepared, training in Braganca begins and the House receives interested Chilean visitor.

Internal: House welcomes guest at Roundtable, celebrates Patrice's birthday and continues House hunting.

Contradiction: Acknowledging and moving our energies onto the death ground of self support while troupes are still maintaining external mission. (Week 5)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: First meeting of the working group with its follow-up assignments survey of health conditions in a nearby London district for European W.H.O. project. Djakarta Participatory Polity Research packet is completed and ready to be taken in person by a volunteer. First meeting of N.S.C. is held with follow-up assignments. Conoco money comes in for last year's LENS.

Internal: Guy Fawkes Night - an unchanged national celebration is enjoyed by the House at the local fireworks display. Three women do the largest ever market in-kind run.

Contradiction: Developing even more time-consuming assignments while troop strength will drop by five volunteer trainees. (Week 5)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House member translates a significant essay on human rights for UNESCO. New Volunteer prospect goes to Brussels for IERD Meeting (Europe/Urasia).

Internal: A prolonged breakfast conversation allows a breakthrough on Benedict's category of Humility.

Contradiction: Enlisting the private sector for the IERD when volunteers and public sector come so much more easily. (Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: LENS Pedagogy Day takes us into methods reflection on modes of social change and Regional vision. Computer Day, P.S.U. on developing English language curriculum, and Flemish Cultural Night (Nov. 11th) keep local and global relatedness before us.

Internal: Wild and Woolly "Going-Sane" with each House member singing a song and reading a poem continues to nurture our "aim and origin" dimension as individual and community. Kathy Barton gets new job as does Rose Caswell. Ken Fisher doubles student load.

Contradiction: Eight great missional teams still clouds the accountability of how self support gets done. (Week 6)*

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Peace Movement Gemeinde Forum, Erlenbach Community Forum and Ludwigshafen Training completion signify all intensive Metros spinning fully. Circuits to Berlin and Koblenz and receipt of 7000 DM mark the shift to regular integrated circuits to all regions. Most events are now being carried out by fully trained indigenous personnel.

Internal: Sojourner and regional colleagues carry out orchestrator roles for the week's forums and bring off a fine ST. Martin's Day celebration complete with goose, and spirit conversation on Martin Luther. Celebration also marks the end of marketing, training and actuation for all self-support strategies.

Contradiction: Winning on scheduled areal formation events while shifting implementation modes from event manoeuvres to integrated strategies. (Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House hosts a day at The Institute for five on Saturday to discuss practics of Volunteering. Three sign up for training before returning home. Development debriefing outlines 27,000 FL committed and 17,000FL. working as outcome of development push. First IERD visit made to Head of the South East Asian Department of the Tropen Institute. Planning sessions, (over three weeks), with the Regional Team surges forward with an intensive two day session of consensus building punctuated in the middle with celebration and ending with House Church, IERD efforts pickup steam when three Dutch colleagues say "yes" to the first meeting about the NSC.

Internal: Internal and external merge as work toward the IERD is held in a pull together of what we know and where to move. Paul Weijers returns from India and joins us for Roundtable and morning collegium. A three week contract with Temple is secured for U.S. army teaching - Joyce attends local creche meeting to plan Sinter Klaas celebration and a year's plan is built to ensure ongoing pedagogy training of House and Team.

Contradiction: Honoring the necessity for Team work on maneuvers and at the same time getting them done se we can move. (Weeks 5,6)*

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: First session of HD-I is held at St. Thomas Aquinas Pontificas University with five more to go. Twenty-nine interviews completed for Italy 2000, eleven appointments are set for development and first nibble at an Italian Sojourner. Three "Italy 2000" interviews held, one of which revealed deep support for human development work in southern Italy. Four new participants in the Italy 2000 meeting. The Jenkins are hosted by Frank and Ruth Archibald in a trip to Naples and Pompeii. First SEM held with four participants; the Marist Brothers request a proposal for funding; calls made on four collegios yield interest in further SEMs this year, and sets up a Human Development course to begin next Thursday.

Internal: Mary Kay Soderland visits, first Roundtable held and typing for IPALMO (a potential research group) continues for self support. House views a film from "Casa per Il Mezzogiorno", a group which does development in Southern Italy, which gives a taste of the Area beyond Rome. SEM occasions extensive work on decor.

Contradiction: Nailing down the key tasks and accomplishments in the midst of flurry of activities and a constantly shifting situation. (Weeks 4,5,6)*

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Brian Williams here on an encouraging development trek in Stockholm and Copenhagen to see the Swedish Cooperative Centre and Danchurch Aid. Mr. Alf Carlsson from the S.C.C., which is the major contributor to the International Cooperative Alliance decides to be on the IERD Global Advisory Board. Mr. Skov-Hanson from Danchurch Aid suggests the I.C.A. become a new partner with them for work in India. Lady Peggy Lindsay arrives for a call on Mr. Fabricius and his wife who decides to be on the Global Advisory Board, and provides us with a list of possible development resources.

Internal: PHC team prepares proceedings for the launch of the health services sector working groups.

Contradiction: Creating a model for allocating and bracketing the fascinating task in relation to PHC in order to win this week, and present it to people involved in the district. (Week 6)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: A circuit to Brugenland and a look over the border into Hungary, reminds us once again that most of Area Budapest is behind the Iron Curtain. Roundtable sees 12 around the table including Campbell and C. Moore from Brussels Nexus and Hannere Golda from Berlin. Invitations to the Fare are sent to Regional people.

Internal: Robert Vibert from Area Montreal arrives in time to help move furniture, prepare wall channels for electric wiring and celebrate the end of the destruction phase and the beginning of the constructive phase of House renovation. House celebrates with Hungarian food and a bottle of Sturn (new wine).

Contradiction: Appropriating House refurbishing as the strategic thrust for this time. (Week 2)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA—EL BAYAD

External: Cluster leader, Sheik Abdel Hamid, assists in securing a letter from the Markaz (District). The people's council president affirms the ICA's expansion plan, thus releasing USD 20,000 Ford FDN grant prior to completing the lengthy routine of a new government contract. Development and inkind blitz, using Cairo gurardians and Margreet Farid, results in LE 1000 working. Linen and cutlery committed and guardians following up on plumbing and electrical supplies.

Internal: The auxillary is soaked as Bayad experiences the worse rain and flash flood anyone can ever remember, Leaving 20-25 homes seriously damaged, the road washed out in two places, electrical lines and water pipes borken and three good size lakes in the village.

Contradiction: Succeeding on four two-week maneuvers when we have not borken through to optimum internal organization and troop assignment rationale. (Week 6)*

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Calling on German companies based in Ivory Coast results in gifts of a House full of furniture, an IBM typewriter, the use of a truck to haul equipment to the Cluster and a VW Van!

Internal: Team of five is now resident in the newly established Cluster Outpost while the development team circuits between the Cluster and Abidjan.

Contradiction: Cash flow slowdown brings slowdown to Outpost and Cluster operations momentum. (Week 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Thirteen Town Meetings in Beudel State were done, ending with an assembly with 760 people. Circuits to Orlu-Imo state secures a new location and self-support. All Saints - Day fills up and overflows with victory in the arrival of a new used inkind Volkswagen, a development cheque, inkind airtickets for Eastern Circuit, and the first bag of flour in ten weeks. Colleagues Longe and Sharta come in to initiate the IERD National Steering Committee. 1500 km circuit to Onitsha Region is "all plusses," with a 50-person meeting of chiefs and key personalities confirms TM set in Izombe for December, a contract confirming new self-support position, and the blessing of guardian Prof. FAO Udekwu. Letters to 30 guardians (announcing re-location of House to the East), and two packets of invitations for the Ghana ICA leadership training programme are completed and posted.

Internal: Mike Amuah, new sojourner arrives from Ghana for one month. The guardians plan for the national steering committee meeting for IERD. The second Roundtable of the year with two guests and two sojourners uses Huston paper to gain new ideas about spirit issues. Joseph Duah arrives and Paul Babbah is sent out, maintaining House strength at eight. House continues to search for outpost in Ikorodu.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between using all forces to deal with immediacies and moving strategically to build a movement. (Weeks 3,5)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: First consult of the new year is held in Kaptel, Nandi District with 70 strong village leaders in attendance. Massive push on materials for consults, bio-intensive manual, health surveys and circuit packets culminates in a yes from a printer to print 30,000 pages of circuit manuals.

Internal: Another week of comings as Linda A. returns from India Panchayat Trek giving two collegiums and gifts to the House while the 4th volunteer Eleanor Richardson arrives from London and is sent to the HDTI for orientation. The House celebrates the completed life of Jennie Slicker, mother of Joseph Slicker.

Contradiction: Funding and authorization while the Nairobi team receives an initial yes from East Africa Breweries and the UNDP to be on the Steering Committee for IERD. (Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KABIRO

External: The Construction Guild finally has delivered prepaid timbers and completed roof trusses for the first two classrooms and store room for Adult Education in Phase II of the Demonstration Structure Complex. The Wakulima Guild elects James Odera as its new chairman. While struggling with late payment of teacher salaries the School committee finds it necessary to be strong and willing to act responsibly.

Internal: Kabiro Auxiliary reaches full strength with the arrival of Stanley Shivayilu and his wife, Neddy, and promptly disperses with three assigned to the Section meeting and one community person recruited for Health Survey Trek of three weeks.

Contradiction: Moving community groups beyond power/prestige tactics toward comprehension of the servant leader role. (Week 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KALWANI—SHAMALAGO

External: The Section House sends out a team for two weeks to Samutet to train village health caretakers. Four circuiters are on the road setting up for Kakemega three saturation, Hawenga and Kutuni Sub-locations consults. Evaluation of health and agricultural training of auxiliaries and village volunteers for Ford Foundation Grant.

Internal: Kenyatta Day celebrated near the new project site visiting Kapenguria Prison where Kenyatta was detained, the event marking the beginning of the Mau Mau.

Contradiction: Discovering ourselves in the midst of many programs and over extended again. (Week 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—MUGUMOINI

External: New structures and methods address Section B Project directors and Muthithi circuiters as preparations are made for the expansion of Muthithi location toward full Division Cluster Projects. Circuiters take the new two day model for circuiters on the road for the first time. Kaptel Consult completed with 60 participants throughout the week, almost all of whom are men.

Internal: Three truck-loads of timber were inkinded for doors, beds, signboards, chicken house and cupboards and circuit training was held after receiving reports. We received Dr. Joseph Mbindyo from the Kenyatta University College for Health Survey Training and then sent the interviewers out to three Sub-locations.

Contradiction: Internalizing new methods and new relationships. (Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA—KAMWELENI

External: Health training graduation certificates arrive for 129 caretakers of Masii location (596 caretakers were trained in Quarter I. Authorization done for Nduluka Cluster Consult (three large villages), and Kilifi division impact (estimated 150 villages) on the coast.

Internal: Kamweleni Training Centre hosts 56 staff from across nation for a council of two-year movement veterans. Section House holds birthday party for Lloyd Philbrook, and Lois Were, both one year old.

Contradiction: Dealing with complex schedule conflicts of a 204 village project. (Week 13)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA

External: Two year visit with Chief Executive Officer at his residence builds much better understanding. He promises to sponsor Imaginal Education for the cluster. Gram Sabha report of Aurangabad Teluke is distributed to more government offices. Site visit from Central Government's Rural Development Dept. goes very well. The Training Centre facility is approved which paves the way for self-support teaching job. New registered dairy society meets for first time with government representatives from Aurangabad. Evening stake walk in Maliwada gives clues about how to awaken the teaching village to its task for the cluster.

Internal: Umikant Singh arrives to host government site visit and helps fill in some of the memory gaps for the staff, which gives more objectivity in relation with the village. The week starts with a shock as the Prior is assigned to H.D.T.I. faculty — a big gestalt shift. Construction on experimental solar cooker get both House and village excited.

Contradiction: Overcoming difficulty in social programs participation occasioned by little economic visibility. (Week 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—CHIKALE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—VAVIHARSH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—JAWALE

External: In Khandala Block three Town Meetings are held involving 835 men and women, bringing the total number of Town Meetings to 44. Three women from the city of Shirval visit Jawale for information on how ICA could help their organization. A block office is set up in Jawale and fitted with tracking charts, maps, DOOP models and a filing system. Jawale Cluster villages hold work days constructing road, drains and doing village beautification.

Internal: The House celebrates Dasera a day which marks the slaying of the 10 headed god Ravana by Rama another god from the north by participating in the village dramas and feasting. Colleagues return from the Continental Council with exciting news about the bottom lines for the whole Sub-Continent. House staff completes construction of one men's dorm. Weekly debriefing on Block and Cluster circuits reveals new advantages and provides practical next steps for next week's circuits.

Contradiction: Empowering Block and Cluster circuits to raise up leadership cores and catalysing on existing momentum before the Holiday Season. (Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—MAALE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—BUDHODA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—SEVAGRAM

External: Catalyzes a long awaited transformation of central village park with nine inkind trees and tree guards planted, painted and protected by Sevagram Youth Club. Visits to Cluster villages reveal strong responsiveness to planned Sevagram HDTI.

Internal: House repairs, paints and decors Emerging Generation room, creates curriculum and makes Quarter long assignment of a team to take seriously the 12 Emerging Generation in its charge. Birthday celebrations give witness to the power of taking life seriously.

Contradiction: Completing models for four sector coordination. (Week 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—TEMBHURWAHI

External: In Tembhurwahi, 150 people plant 600 trees and students plant 75 trees around Primary School. CDA makes strategy to complete Gandhi statue, preschool building and register Youth Manda. The women's Mandal meets and plans to enable health camp and elect a new executive. Local doctor does inkind motorcycle repair. Build Quarter II Actuation timelines in four Cluster villages. A breakthrough on block extension as Larsen and Toubro Co. village improvement officers says yes to Gram Sabhas in his "cluster" and joins the bi-Metro Team.

Internal: Whole Ashram celebrates at Tembhurwahi Sathe Narayam Puja. The forest Guard is a Roundtable guest. Plant shade trees around staff bedrooms.

Contradiction: Moving decisively in the midst of financial uncertainty and adjusting our cluster actuation time design to match farmers' daily timeline. (Week 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—DAHABAD

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: A full week of events in the Chavrassi Cluster with the first Village Leaders Training School a fine success involving 30 participants. Lunches, drinks, plates, cups, tents, dorries, and buses are all inkinded from local companies. Faridabad Lions Club is hosted during shramdam (workday) and health camp in Sarohi village. Highlight of Sir James' visit is a yes from Canara Bank to Co-sponsor the IERD.

Internal: Anthony and Makhond arrive from Bombay and Chikhale to join the VLTS faculty team. Greetas' 25th birthday is celebrated with the whole House at the Bata Club for Week II discontinuity.

Contradiction: Grounding the "on-behalf-of" context from the VLTS with programmes and events which call for participation and responsibility from village leader teams. (Week 2)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Bombay signal check creates a continental consensus for Area Madras strategy. In Hyderabad 90 names are targeted for Annual Appeal; and another Occupational Therapy speaking engagement opens up new contacts and course possibilities.

Internal: Two Prakash children are enrolled in school bringing the total now to six EG in full-time EG school structures.

Contradiction: Realising the need to win in self support and development this quarter in order to do the 100% victory over the next two years. (Week 4)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: An Imaginal Education course with 33 teachers at St. Marys' School ends with staff deciding to meet the next day to implement the local plan, and results in many new Guild members and the possibility for on-going work with the school. The Annual Appeal is launched with the first commitments from the Bustee Guild. The whole House corporately reviews the Quarter II plan after participating in the Continental "check-signal".

Internal: A week of feasting and celebration is held as the House participates with the deity in "Durga Puja" (Hindu feast) and "Muharrum" (Musum feast) celebration of Sarita Prasad's third birthday, lunch with land ladies, and Sarita's first day at school. The House has an evening discussing Hindu mythology and is amazed by the corelations between other mythologies and religions.

Contradiction: Frog-backing the Annual Appeal as a catalytic strategy to build mementum through-out the Quarter. (Weeks 4,5)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Regional "Think Tank" researches voluntary organizatins in the HDZ. A report on the Health Fair is written and approved by the Health Department, 38 HDZ preschool teachers meet to do training and curriculum preparation.

Internal: K. Newkirk is welcomed home from the hospital. Two guests visit for Roundtable.

Contradiction: Maintaining focus of the teams on the quarter's objectives. (Week 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: LENS is held with Straits Times Publications staff from Singapore and Malaysia in Bagio, Philippines. A series of work nights transfroms the House for hosting the Reginal Team.

Internal: Collegium by Kamali on Malaysian Government machinery, the Roundtable and an Evening at Benting provide ambience in the week.

Contradiction: House experiences being dispersed this week as a post-ponelement to our Quarters planning. (Week 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Think Tank preparation continues with five research visits and 13 registrations. Marketing blitz for G.L.S. and LENS has visits to PTPs 20, 24, 25, 26, and 23 in Surabaya and Jakarta. This is supported by Jakarta Moboil office for 10 days. IERD National Steering Committee V.P. Adam Malik secretary offers letters of introduction to possible National Steering Committee members.

Internal: The House celebrates two birthdays, Dan Tuecke and Jacob Neat; and sends Make Hoff to Kuala Lumpur, Christina Clark to Hong Kong, Dan and Pat Teucke to Ujung Pandang. The highlight of the first Roundtable is the study dynamic, particularly the paper MEGATREND OF INFORMATION SOCIETY.

Contradiction: Finishing the first four weeks of the HUFFCO G.L.S. with power and impact, while negotiating the follow up and next steps. (Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Two major training programs going simultaneously as village leader training continues and methods training with U.P. contractors is launched. A four year evaluation of BHDP is written and submitted to local and provincial officials. Bentoa celebrates its fourth year anniversary. Two week long village leader training program is completed. Visits to key frame and guardians reveals vast possibility for the future. PNP28 requests a training program to follow-up the recent LENS.

Internal: Rochmat's long-awaited arrival is followed by the first visit of the Tuecke's to the Region. Major strategy session with Area Priors is followed by an afternoon enjoying the amenities at a nearby recreation area and waterfall.

Contradiction: Maintaining our integrity regarding the global consensus while standing open to local possibilities. (Weeks 4,5)*

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: A slide show of life in a Chinese village near Canton presented by a regional colleague, illuminates the social and political changes happening in the midst of China's liberalization.

Internal: Jeanne Glowan's stay to gather research on non-western healing methods provides an opportunity for all sorts of interesting visitors.

Contradiction: Pushing the many possibilities for program through to the catalytic focus that will do them all. (Week 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE:TAIPEI

External: Fall Planning Council brings 15 new and old Regional colleagues together for focus on program thrusts of the year. Surprising result is a keen interest in House life, with creation of weekly guest collegium series on China research and commitments to regular Roundtable participation. Hai Ou committee develops plan for spending \$40,000 Government grant on community facilities and beautification. This year's marketing thrust is initiated as the House conducts demonstration supervisor's course modules for 20 people and marketing visits net five working programs including LENS, ESC, and GLS. Attending International Small Farms conference in Taipei stimulates our imagination and opens contacts for IERD, including meeting Parlindungan form Indonesia. The "professional" image begins to emerge with major space renovations beginning implementation of decor model and arrival of (partially) inkind xerox machine.

Internal: The House and guests are impacted by "Neighborhood" recollection conversation at Roundtable. Peter Hu completes translation of 44 paragraphs of Chiang-tzu. A week of exciting internal events is highlighted by one day which combines a national holiday, our fast day and a full day of missional team arena brooding and planning.

Contradiction: Structuring our depth preparation so that every encounter is a profound impact on people's consciousness. (Weeks 4,5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Week of appointments for LENS and development includes visits to Resendo Marques and the staff of the NASAC and Msgr. Ortiz specifically with an eye on IERD and Academy Philippines. Guardian Bob Anderson gives valuable advice and contacts for legal mobility of money in and out of the Philippines. Roundtable includes Mary Hernando and Tony Ywe of Philippine Geothermal. Zamboanga site visit comes up with three prospective villages out of thirteen. Final A.I.D. evaluation is completed while A.D.A.B. contract is drawn up. Jerry Jimenez and David Dichupa drop members into House on visit to Manila with an invitation to go to Iloko for Academy recruitment.

Internal: House sends out team from Manila and Cebu to Zamboanga Del Sur and one to Putsan, Tiwi. Jesse Navaretti Sojourns for a week. House participates in national holiday, purchases new House decor at the local market revealing multitudes of folk art, and at the same time stocking up with "bonsai" plants. Friday evening "nitter natter" are launched with informal reports of week.

Contradiction: Keeping low ICA profile while doing national manoeuvres . (Weeks 4,5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA-PUTSAN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: A week of circuits to M-24 ELNC clinics (preschools) results in staff meeting together to plan the preschool curriculum for the next five weeks and getting paid. The demonstration farm in Sudtonggan plants another 222 ampalaya plants and begins harvesting its first ampalaya crop. MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY

External: The new CYF manual is printed in time for training session in Nezahualcoyotl, and the community agrees to a Community LENS in January. First film show of the year is a success with guests remaining until late talking of development in Mexico.

Internal: House celebrates two birthdays, Araceli and Melisa Mathews, and the completion of language classes for Jack and Judy Gilles and John Foss.

Contradiction: Activating back burner items now that school is over when the immediate issue of a new location and furniture loom as a consuming major effort. (Week 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: IERD visits begin in Guatemala with visit to United Nations Guatemala. In Conacaste 37 villagers from neighboring village appear with hopes and dreams to be realized. Advances are made on drip irrigation project with legal go-ahead on construction of holding tanks and water filter systems. Team writes and starts translation process on first six-month progress report on irrigation project for IADB. Demonstration farm delivers major tomato harvest to market just as prices rise. Preschool sells its pig and takes a trip to zoo with its income from the sale.

Internal: Epley family arrives at project on Independence Day to see parade of cowboys on horseback and then is assigned immediately off to language school.

Contradiction: Training local committees in good financial practices so that they can maintain credibility in the eyes of the public. (Week 5)*

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON

External: The ICA-Rotary partnership is solidified with training models consensed upon, committee meeting held, account approved and luncheon attended. Woburn Lawn Co-op completes IDB Progress Report, begins Health Outpost construction, purchases equipment and hosts site visit by A. T. International (Washington, D.C.). Cluster Team holds three village assemblies, distributes VOICE, making use of Ministry of Agriculture landrover.

Internal: House welcomes Len and Joyce Farr for a two week sojourn from Coos Bay, Oregon.

Contradiction: Weaving Cluster, IERD, HDTI, Woburn Lawn Co-op, management and development into one coherent doable strategy. (Week 5)*

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA

External: Development Team intensifies the funding pace with 16 visits, \$4500 committed, \$3000 working and \$30,000 in view for '83'. The IERD is launched with eight visits and a reception set for Lindsays through the American Chamber of Commerce invitation to its 1500 members. An Azpitia committee of 20 people prepares to host 150 with a traditional feast for the Trainig Center ground breaking next week.

Internal: Intensified global language training is held in Azpitia with the beginning of classes in the Primary School five days a week. The students go through two weeks of planned curriculum in three days. The House Teams are on the road with visits to three villages which involve milk distribution, library set-up and recruitment for the Human Development Lab. They also travel to Cupertino to conduct a Town Meeting. The public relations campaign continues with visits to F.O.N.I.A.P., FEDERACION COMPESSINA, Caucagua High School and the Malaria Institute.

Internal: Kip May represents Area in Caracas mini marathon. "Captain Video" Betamax tapes from Chicago are best form of interchange to date! House celebrates Ramona's 30th birthday with a grand fish feast by candlelight.

Contradiction: Seizing upcoming events - school in Cano Negro, Lindsay visits, medical trek - as tactical catalysts rather than interruptions. (Weeks 3,5)*

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: Lindsay visit - two weeks off - continues to push Chile frame by leaps and bounds with fine visits to Ministry of Foreign affairs (public), Mayor (local), Dr. Monckeberg (private), and IMPRU (voluntary). Sol Women's Foro in Maria Pinto - both in Spanish. Santiago College sets December 3 for Youth Foro.

Internal: House is hosted by the iron women of the Sol Panadaria (bakery) at a great 4th year celebration.

Contradiction: Releasing hidden gianthood for the Lampa Comuna Foro. (Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: Amaury Temporal say yes to hosting a meeting for Sir James Lindsay with the Commercial Association of Rio De Janeiro. The site to build a health clinic in Bracana has been cleared and cleaned. Team sewing teacher begins the Mata sewing course with 33 students who learn how to cut blouses. Bracana and Tatus farmers begin planting the third demonstration banana plot with 500 plants.

Internal: House's quail raising demonstration yields three eggs during the week and doubles during the weekend. The House barbeques on the beach in Saquarema, David goes to kindergarten (to learn Portuguese), and E.G. garbage corps is formed.

Contradiction: Directing efforts in program activities without coming into a halt as peoples' attention is focused on the election season which is the first after a number of years. (Week 3,5)*

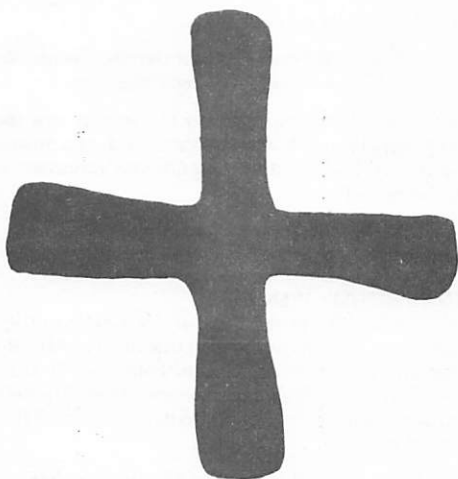
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

The Ministry of Agriculture accompanies the auxiliary to Ferreiros to begin a village soil testing program. Sister Borgia goes on calls in Porto with the Development team in an inked car. Four LENS are set up in Viseu with rural co-operatives and Caixa de Credito. The Institute for Small Industries commits for an Economic Module. The House triples itself in four locations, reaping victories on every front.

Internal: Management trek arrival occasions a reception in honor of Martha with colleagues present, ordered Miserior grant accounting, a spirited roundtable, and collegiums on House budgeting, secondary integrity and revolutionary spending.

Contradiction: Using the Management trek to create positive story images about Miserior monies and to turn colleagues from nice and interesting project images to priority funding for visible signs.(Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Eight days of G.C.F.s are done in six villages of the Comarca of Ariza in the Province of Zaragoza, ending with a fine assembly of all six villages. Also, full imaginal leadership training sessions were done each day for the local team - all in Spanish. Spain's two Global Advisory Board members were visited and updated. Barbara and Lucy finish up the second set of seven villages (13 in 2 weeks) with a grand assembly in Braganca, Northeastern Portugal.

Internal: Maria Fry and Bill Alerding return from exciting Ariza (Zaragoza) meetings and begin pulling together an Imaginal Education training document for Spanish translation. They also bring a huge box of almonds as a gift from a local Ariza team. Mary Kaye returns from her 3 week European trek for Ohio's Wittenberg University while Sara Lilja prepares for her trip to the Lamego HDZ empowerment trek.

Contradiction: Focusing on new demands on IERD and the Alcorcon set of meetings in the midst of five other time consuming missional demands.(Week 7)*

National Steering Committee meeting is held with nine representatives from across the area demonstrating a willingness to work and commitment to funding and publicity - creating a £60,000 budget and plans for symposium.

Internal: The House hosts three events, with 23 people present during the week with an additional five on the weekend. The E.G. sees the Lord Mayor's show, a garden is planted, and the kitchen transformed. The whole House celebrates by seeing an Indian dance festival. Contradiction: Bringing the rest of the quarter into focus to determine effective expenditure. (Weeks 6&7)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Team sends out the newsletter with a striking drawing of the photograph of two women (from India brochure) in a gesture of mutual respect - a symbol for the IERD. The House creates broad outlines of a nine month house hunt strategy. A team studies the effects of computers on society.

Internal: M.K.Soderlind's visit, though short, brings significant sharing on IERD support in Spain and brooding on the life of the Order.

Contradiction: Strategically enlarging the nation's steering committee of the IERD.(Week 5)*

e08RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Events keep the Training Centre busy every day: Third Wave Study, Women's Studies, Teachers' Meeting, Social Change Think Tank, HDZ - RSP.

Internal: Lieve, Herman, and Kenneth turn carpenter and build a collegium table for twenty, giving elbow room and space for dinner guests. Bob Gilbert's slides provide a 'laugh-in' evening and 'myths' fill our Going Sane evening.

Contradiction: Getting the wheels (like money) under the missional vehicle now that the engine is racing. (Week 7)*

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The participatory polity think tank gives new perspective and excitement to the House relative to all research and the role it can play in our relation to Germany, the future and the world. Two from Frankfurt participate in the Brussels Regional Strategy Event.

Twenty-nine interviews completed for Italy 2000, eleven appointments are set for development and first nibble at an Italian sojourner. Three "Italy 2000" interviews held, one of which reveals deep support for Human Development work in southern Italy. Four new participants in the Italy 2000 meeting. The Jenkins are hosted by Frank and Ruth Archibald on a trip to Naples and Pompeii. First SEM held with four participants; the Marist Brothers request a proposal for funding; calls made on four collegios yield interest in further SMSs this year, and sets up a Human Development Course to begin next Thursday.

Internal: Mary Kay Soderland visits, first roundtable held and typing for IPALMO (a potential research group) continues for self support. House views a film from "Casa per Il Mezzogiorno", a group which does development in southern Italy, which gives a taste of the area beyond Rome. SEM occasions extensive work on decor.

Contradiction: Nailing down the key tasks and accomplishments in the midst of flurry of activities and a constantly shifting situation.(Weeks 4,5&6)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Swedish Co-operative Centre sends 33 page in-depth report on the ICA done on their own initiative and gives permission to use it for fund raising authorization. Several more people ask to be on the Regional Team following HDZ launch. Procedures for the Third Urban Health Sector:Community life are created at Tuesday evening workshop led totally by colleagues.

Internal: Other world conversation significates our Regional Team midweek dinner and evening collegium.

Contradiction: Orienting carefully the twelve new members of the Regional Team while maintaining a strong position with frame, strategy and helpful assignments rationale in HDZ research.(Week 7)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: A circuit to Brugenland and a look over the border into Hungary remind us once again that most of Area Budapest is behind the Iron Curtain. Roundtable sees 12 around the table including Campbell and C.Moore from Brussels Nexus and Hannere Golda from Berlin. Invitations to the Fair are sent to Regional people.

Internal: Robert Vibert from Area Montreal arrives in time to help move furniture, prepare wall channels for electric wiring and celebrate the end of the destruction phase and the beginning of the construction phase of House renovation. House celebrates with Hungarian food and a bottle of Sturn (new wine).

Contradiction: Appropriating House refurbishing as the strategic thrust for this time.(Week 2)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE GIZA — EL BAYAD

External: Cluster leader,Sheik Abdel Hamid, assists in securing a letter from the Markaz(District). The People's Council President affirms the ICA's expansion plan, thus releasing USD 20,000 Ford Foundation grant prior to completing the lengthy routine of a new government contract. Development and inkind blitz, using Cairo guardians and Margreet Farid, results in LE 1000 working. Linen and cutlery committed and guardians following up on plumbing and electrical supplies.

Internal: The auxiliary is soaked as Bayad experiences the worst rain and flash flood anyone can ever remember, leaving 20-25 homes seriously damaged, the road washed out in two places, electrical lines and water pipes broken and three good size lakes in the village.

Contradiction: Succeeding on four two-week manuevres when we have not broken through to optimum internal organization and troop assignment rationale.(Week 6)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Calling on German companies based on Ivory Coast results in gifts of a House full of furniture, an IBM typewriter, the use of a truck to haul equipment to the cluster and a VW van!

Internal: Team of five is now resident in the newly established Cluster Outpost while the development team circuits between the Cluster and Abidjan.

Contradiction: Cash flow slowdown brings slowdown to Outpost and Cluster operations momentum.(Week 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Visits to key guardians strengthen IERD and the second meeting of the IERD National Steering Committee is hosted. Development nets another \$1200 to put on top of last week's largest week of \$5600US. A quick trip to Benin City sets up the follow-up on village cooperatives with the Nigerian Rubber Board.

Internal: House participates in a newsletter mailing blitz as Quarter III vision and planning takes shape. Bells pack for their visa reentry trip to Abidjan and Lee Ferguson wraps up four years of work as he packs for London. Strategy collegiums are capped off with a great 'poverty' muse. The House experiences a great week of collegiums on Research Think Tanks and Order Principles. ICA belongings are moved to new office outpost in Ikoridu in preparation for Lagos House relocation in Orlu in December.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the details of finances, development, communications and IERD so that momentum is maintained on all fronts.

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Circuits to the Diamond of Zambia end with three village assemblies. The result is that three pre-school buildings are under various stages of construction. This was a three week maneuver. Villages industry complex generates K631.00 since September 21st and management team begins to create the systems necessary to run the truck, tractor, maize mill and carpenters smoothly. Women's mat industry sells 80 mats to one hardware store after completing an order for 300 mats delivered to another. Site visits include the Danish Volunteer Service, the Swedish School, Roundtables, YWCA, and Lions Club, with the highlight being the Christian Children's Funds who returned the next day with cameras to take pictures of the pre-school and to promise support in March '83 when their Lusaka office opens. Development reports that K4000 is raised from 15 different donors.

Internal: Rev Muloshi reports on his experience at Academy. The House and village Independence Day celebration (October 24th) results in a chicken feast at Mundewanga Zoo, and occasions laughter as well as thoughtful reflection on the coming year. Sending Danaraj to his new assignment grounds the fact that we are a small team.

Contradiction: Knowing that 'small is beautiful', deciding to continue rather than wait for new arrivals.

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Focus is on bilateral funding as massive local development continues as Swedish Cooperation Society makes a site visit. Norad grant accountability is submitted to the Auditor. We receive EEC money. The SCC Board visits Muputi villages and is received with wild success by dancing villagers. A reciprocal interview on radio's "Voice of Kenya" introduces ICA's global work to the general radio public and an invitation is received for a second interview on the IERD. A two day National Project Directors' Meeting pushes us all on circuit training and equipping to train village leaders. Swedish Cooperative Society's affirmative evaluation of Muputi Location is received in time for section guns meeting. Three development teams cross like ships in the night with reports of circuits to Eldonet, Makuru, Mombasa, Machakos and Maikuu.

Internal: The House experiences a new form of eight step reflection and up-to-date report on Black Africa by Joseph Slicker on his return from the US and Brussels. The House hosts 68 participants for dinner with Global Film and Kenya slides.

Contradiction: Compositing our support functions while half of the House is involved in impact. (Weeks 6&7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KABIRO

External: The Construction Guild finally has delivered prepaid timbers and completed roof trusses for the first two classrooms and store room for Adult Education in Phase II of the Demonstration Structure Complex. The Wakulima Guild elects James Odera as its new chairman. While struggling with late payment of teacher salaries the School committee finds it necessary to be strong and willing to act responsibly.

Internal: Kabiro Auxiliary reaches full strength with the arrival of Stanley Shivayilu and his wife Neddy, and promptly disperses with three assigned to the Section meeting and one community person recruited for Health Survey Trek of three weeks.

Contradiction: Moving community groups beyond power/prestige tactics toward comprehension of the servant leader role. (Week 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: The Section House sends out a team for two weeks to Samutet to train village health caretakers. Four circuiters are on the road setting up for Kakemega three saturation, Hawenga and Kutuni Sub-locations consults. Evaluation of health and agriculture training of auxiliaries and village volunteers for Ford Foundation Grant continues.

Internal: Kenyatta Day celebrated near the new project site visiting Kapenguiria Prison where Kenyatta was detained, the event marking the beginning of the Mau Mau.

Contradiction: Discovering ourselves in the midst of many programs and over extended again. (Week 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-MUGUMOINI

External: New structures and methods address Section B Project Directors and the Muthithi circuiters as preparations are made for the expansion of the Muthithi location toward full Division Cluster Projects. Circuiters take the new two day model for circuiters on the road for the first time. Kaptel Consult is completed with 60 participants throughout the week, almost all of whom are men.

Internal: Three truck loads of timber are inkinded for doors, beds, signboards, chicken house and cupboards and circuit training is held after receiving reports. We receive Dr Joseph Mbindyo from the Kenyatta University College for the Health Survey Training and then send the interviewers out to three Sub-locations.

Contradiction: Internalizing new methods and new relationships. (Week 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA-KAMWELINI

External: Health training graduation certificates arrive for 129 caretakers of Massai location (596 caretakers were trained in Quarter 1). Authorization done for Nduluka Cluster Consult (three large villages) and Kilifi division impact (estimated 150 villages) on the coast.

Internal: Kamwelini Training Centre hosts 56 staff from across nation for a council of two-year movement veterans. Section House holds birthday party for Lloyd Philbrook, and Lois Were, both one year old.

Contradiction: Dealing with complex schedule conflicts of a 204 village project. (Week 13)

AREA BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA

External: Two year visit with Chief Executive Officer at his residence builds much better understanding. He promises to sponsor Imaginal Education for the cluster. Gram Sabha report of Aurangabad Taluka is distributed to more government offices. Site visit from Central Government's Rural Development Dept. goes very well. The Training Centre facility is approved which paves the way for self-support teaching job. New registered dairy society meets for first time with government representatives from Aurangabad. Evening stake walk in Maliwada gives clues about how to awaken the teaching village to its task for the cluster.

Internal: Umakant Singh arrives to host government site visit and helps fill in some of the memory gaps for the staff, which gives more objectivity in relation with the village. The week starts with a shock as the Prior is assigned to H.D.T.I. faculty — a big gestalt shift. Construction on experimental solar cooker get both House and village excited.

Contradiction: Overcoming difficulty in social programs participation occasioned by little economic visibility. (Week 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—CHIKHALE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—VAVIHARSH

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—JAWALE

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (this is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Establishing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actuation. (Week 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—MAALE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—BUDHODA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—SEVAGRAM

External: The school district holds a tournament of games in Sevagram and the staff hosts many visitors. Rs3000 is raised for Annual Appeal from Nagpur. Bakery accounts for the last six months are completed.

Internal: The kitchen is spruced up with a fine whitewash job and the office re-organized after HDTs is completed.

Contradiction: Creating necessary practical models to enable quick movement after Divali. (Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—TEMBURWAHI

External: In Temburwahi, 150 people plant 600 trees and students plant 75 trees around Primary School. CDA builds strategy to complete Gandhi statue, preschool building and register Youth Mandal. The Women's Mandal meets and plans to enable health camp and elect a new executive. Local doctor does inkind motorcycle repair. Quarter II Actuation timelines are built in four Cluster villages. A breakthrough occurs on block extension as Larsen and Toubro Co. village improvement officer says yes to Gram Sabhas in his 'cluster' and joins the bi-Metro Team.

Internal: Whole Ashram celebrates Sathé Narayan Puja in Temburwahi. The Forest Guard is a Roundtable guest. We plant shade trees around staff bedrooms.

Contradiction: Moving decisively in the midst of financial uncertainty and adjusting our cluster actuation time design to match farmers' daily timeline. (Week 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—DABHAD

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Five leading representatives of Canara Bank, Delhi visit Khore E Sarohi to talk with villagers and confirm their resolve to work directly with us on total village development in the cluster. Annual Appeal nets Rs 4750 in hand, Rs15000 committed and Rs1200 inkind. Government of India symbolizes its support of Nava Gram Prayas by giving a 'no objection' letter to the IERD. The national TV crew spends two days in Sikrol filming the village. First village signboard is painted and erected.

Internal: Tribhuwans arrive after continental assignment at HDTI, while Bhoyars leave for Divali discontinuity. The GDC and Panchayat honours the House with their presence. Annual Appeal team enables a fine feast at the Round Table celebration with chicken and inkind beer.

Contradiction: Deciding we can build the necessary models to make a demonstration of our Internal Life. (Weeks 5&6)*

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Bombay signal check creates a continental consensus for Area Madras strategy. In Hyderabad 90 names are targeted for Annual Appeal, and another Occupational Therapy speaking engagement opens up new contacts and course possibilities.

Internal: Two Prakash children are enrolled in school bringing the total now to six EG in full-time school structures.

Contradiction: Realising the need to win in self support and development this quarter in order to do the 100% victory over the next two years. (Week 4)*

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: An Imaginal Education course with 33 teachers at St. Marys' School ends with staff deciding to meet the next day to implement the local plan, and results in many new Guild members and the possibility for on-going work with the school. The Annual Appeal is launched with the first commitments from the Bustee Guild. The whole House corporately reviews the Quarter II plan after participating in the Continental 'check-signals'.

Internal: A week of feasting and celebration is held as the House participates with the deity in 'Durga Puja' (Hindu feast) and 'Muharrum' (Muslim feast), celebration of Sarita Prasad's third birthday, lunch with landladies, and Sarita's first day at school. The House has an evening discussing Hindu mythology and is amazed by the correlations between other mythologies and religions.

Contradiction: Frog-backing the Annual Appeal as a catalytic strategy to build momentum through-out the Quarter. (Weeks 4,5)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: Over 100 people gather for an all-day forum to initiate the Kecamatan Development Committee. Representatives from all four sectors include all government agencies, key provincial agencies, Vice-Rector of the University of N.Sumatra and 3 staff, the Chamber of Commerce, Lions Clubs, and all the villages in the HDZ.

Internal: The Newkirks visit Namu Rambe, Dan Tuecke visits Medan Region and two sojourners move in.

Contradiction: Commonizing the story that allows ongoing long term trusting relationship with the villages, agencies and companies even when teams rotate and staff changes. (Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: 25 clerks and typists participate in an E.C.M. (Effective Clerical Management) in United Motor Works. Major push on Regional Development with Marsha Stansbury and Elizabeth in the Region. Another module is confirmed with BERJAYA KAWAT for executives. A visit with Kuala Lumpur Rotary results in a presentation.

Internal: Mr Kamali (sojourner) and Sang Chul take off to Batu Pahat for celebrating Deewali (Indian Christmas) while Dharma and Krishnan visit friends, relatives and colleagues in the Region. The House also participates in a concert performed by the Commodores.

Contradiction: Equipping the team with marketing materials and a story towards Regional participation for the Jakarta GRA. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: The first Think Tank in the Region, 'Women's Development in Indonesia', brings together eleven women who have an interview with the first Woman's Minister, Maria Ulfah, in the revolutionary government of 1945-48. The four week Global Language School ends, the first with a private sector company, with promises of more schools this year. The Board of the Institute of Cultural Affairs: Indonesia approves a budget of \$205,000, confirms finance procedures and takes responsibility for raising \$90,000. First week of a two-week development push creates Rp 44,000,000 of working money and Research Assembly brochures are mailed

Internal: Tueckes return from Bontoa where one week's work brings great strides towards a new government agreement with the Province. The House creates a live Meditative Council using the meditation game construct from the Academy Ecclesiola Guide. A Week II workday creates a dramatic transformation of House space with enlarged, more functional kitchen, sparkling new-painted office and lounge and new collegium wall and white board. The House welcomes Elizabeth Caperton and Marsha Stansbury for development, and Don Clark to put a new spark under the GRA preparation.

Contradiction: With no registrations in hand, how to ensure participation in the participative polity GRA in only 2½ weeks. (Weeks 6&7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Discussions with the provincial planning department reveal Governments expectations of ICA and our own Global Strategies coinciding. First draft of the four year plan and budget is completed and presented for further polishing. Bupatti (Local Government Head) submits positive written evaluation to Governor of ICA's activities over the past four years. A week of much table sitting completes a quarterly report, produces exciting constructs for Regional Think Tank, government officers' methods training, and PNP28 LENS followup training modules.

Internal: House is awed with Rochmad's fantastic collegium on Egypt and at the depth of spirit awareness revealed at week's Roundtable. Sojourner, Abdul Majid, leads a Round table muse with dramatic skill. 200kg of rice is inkinded and the House car gets a new front floor.

Contradiction: Finding ways to organize assignments to enable the whole task to be completed and each member to experience the next steps on the journey. (Week 6)*

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: A slide show of life in a Chinese village near Canton presented by a regional colleague, illuminates the social and political changes happening in the midst of China's liberalization.

Internal: Jeanne Glowan's stay to gather research on non-western healing methods provides an opportunity for all sorts of interesting visitors.

Contradiction: Pushing the many possibilities for program through to the catalytic focus that will do them all. (Week 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: A Saturday Think Tank on how the information age affects participatory polity brings six representatives from China Gulf Plastics along with other guests to the House. Development visits 14 companies, mails seven proposals, and receives NT\$30,000 from Mattel. First visits for advice on the Taiwan NSC are made with Joe Moore, an energy consultant to the government, and Bosco Lee, from the College of Agriculture at the National Taiwan University.

Internal: Collegium led by colleague Bill Wang comes close to naming the profound contradiction of Chinese culture revealed through the philosophies of Confucious and Chuang-tye.

Contradiction: Finding ways to appropriate deep insights into Chinese reality and build effective, long term strategy based on them. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Preparing for the coming week with creation of models and design for the HDZ Lab in Sudtonggan. ADAB contract is approved by the Australian Government in Canberra.

Internal: Two Australian priests 'drop in' on the House, also ITI grad who wants updated Community Forum methods. Roundtable is held with two guests and is highlighted by journal writing in the method of 'progaff'.

Contradiction: Creating the HDZ design that will allow an economic self sufficiency breakthrough for Human Development in the twentieth century. (Week 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA-PUTSAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Food is delivered in Mactan 24. Sudtonggan's free clinic has 40 patients and the Bang-bang clinic has 20 patients. The ampalaya harvest begins and 200 new ampalaya plants are transplanted.

Internal: Jailu is sent out to Manila and Ben to Putsan. A house workday is held for the HDZ Lab preparation. PADAP visitor Robert Shark and his son Steve visit.

Contradiction: Looking forward to how to build a strong effective strategy of the economic venture of the Mactan (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: House welcomes Stephen Leanhouts and Hermenia Banayo for a conference on the new budget. The Carmen Quarterly weighing report is sent to MSSD. House staff joins the Inauguration of new Langub Elementary School Building, and assemblywoman Felecedad Santos is a visitor during that occasion.

Internal: House staff changes assignment for every village worker, for greater effectivity in the project.

Contradiction: Consensing on focused action for the Demonstration Farm and to self-support the Pre-School Teacher. (Week 3)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: The ICA Board holds its first meeting at the House and schedules regular monthly meetings. Membership certificates are printed and ready for the membership campaign. First Boston Bank proposal for \$30,000 is submitted with backup by Jeff Coolidge. Three urban slum preschools are visited to follow up a very successful Imaginal Education course for volunteer preschool workers as part of the continuing urban research.

Internal: The House welcomes a new sojourner Lee Young Min and Mark and Pat, visitors from Edmonton. Jeff Coolidge visits the House and shares wisdom on development and the IERD. Ten guests participate in the Roundtable.

Contradiction: Extending wisdom of Council strategies to a common regional story that enables urban demonstration focus. (Weeks 5&6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-CHEONG WON

External: The Director of the UNDP in Korea visits Cheong Won cluster with two Seoul staff. A cluster leaders meeting is held as the first step in initiating the DOOP model which can sustain the villages for themselves.

Internal: Paul and Carol Schwobel visit the House to research for a facility. For three days, the House makes 80 cabbages of winter kimchi.

Contradiction: Refreshing the leaders' images about a new kind of meeting structure in the midst of their images of past unfruitfulness of gathering together. (Weeks 6&7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The Kokura Branch of the Kyushu-sogo Bank Union, holds a 40 person Town Meeting led by two advisors, 1 volunteer and two ICA staff. Jean Hanson and Joyce Reese participate in an ESL 2-day session with other staff in Tokyo. The Global Film is shown to 20 people one evening and to Roundtable on Saturday evening. Invitations are sent out to members for Charter Night. Local Hotel is rented for Charter Night. Eight guests at Roundtable participate in a new version of our old Community Creation game; Staff members attend a 'New Village Meeting' and appear on the TV coverage; Staff and advisors also participate in a local meeting about China and meet potential future network contacts.

Internal: New English classes continue to develop. Three members of one family become ICA members. Bob completes second marathon; this one at Hiroshima. A new children's class expands the Economic Ventures program. Advisor gift of tickets enables three to attend afternoon SUMO and meet the BIIIIIG MEN.

Contradiction: Setting up new forms and styles for the Regional Team. (Weeks 6&7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Two one-day circuits to three prefectures reveal that team leaders who participated in Town Meeting seven months ago are continuing to meet, and providing leadership to new Life School! Next steps are taken in planning the International Women's Seminar, November 29th, with former GWF forum participants involved.

Internal: Four new people attend Friday Night at the Institute to study 'What's happening in Asia'. Vera and Deann leave for Tokyo to attend long awaited Language Teaching Lab.

Contradiction: Finding the best form of engagement for a wide variety of colleagues through significant events. (Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Old and new supporters contribute to a successful week of Development with Y562,000 in hand. Sapporo Regional Colleague Manami Kitamura is sent out as a volunteer to India after a great week at Tokyo House. A Think Tank on Japanese forms of polity suggests that style rather than method is key. 'English as a Second Language' Think Tank brings ICA staff from across Japan to Tokyo for an intensive weekend and reveals new movemental possibilities from English teaching. Advisors meet to plan and co-ordinate December first Charter Night event. Tokyo Training Centre receives inkind kitchen equipment from Philips Electric Company.

Internal: House hosts colleagues for E.S.L. Think Tank, and Manami Kitamura from Sapporo on her way to India and sends out Jim Patterson for week long intensive English job. Canada is highlighted at Roundtable as six guests are hosted for an evening of song, story and film. Teaching an intensive English course with a German firm delivers both high income and key European contacts.

Contradiction: Breaking through old images of missional engagement to build the opportunities and structures that will expand and engage the network of movemental colleagues. (Weeks 6&7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Membership Charter night on November 13th is a fine celebrative event with 26 members and friends present. Video tape recorder is presented to the House by new member, Kenji Inoue, at the close of Charter Night. A fine Town Meeting in Kurisawa, first visited five years ago with the New Life Movement, sets a solid foundation for further work with that Movement in Hokkaido and future possibilities in Kurisawa. Contradiction: Getting our priorities straight relative to recruitment, curriculum, practics etc in the time we have left. (Week 7)*

Contradiction: Providing the context that puts every action in the global perspective. (Weeks 6&7)*

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: PTS training/Roundtable research with two national agricultural leaders illuminates the vision, contradictions and accomplishments of the primary economic arena for 40 Tongan faculty in training. Bread for the World proposal for USD10000 submitted by Dr. Havea on Methodist Church of Tonga stationary. 30 development letters for PTS scholarships are sent by the staff to contacts in U.S. and Philippines. Nau'utoka village meeting has 90 participants, Kalonga village meeting has 35. Local orchestrators lead both meetings. Conversation with Church business manager regrounds the hurricane devastation and need for village development. Four guests attend Roundtable and have a group interview with the 40 participants on teachers and the needs for the future in teacher training and development.

Internal: Hong Kong Nexus phonecall shares news and data. Invention of the Order collegium deepens consciousness of Order journey and necessity for keeping the practical vision and future story before. PTS priory collegium with Dr. Havea and director of Village Development for Tonga Council of Churches deepens consensus on the next year. .

Contradiction: Creating the revolutionary forms and style that allow us to move in the midst of ambiguity about resources. (Week 6)*

External: Roundtable participants are addressed by Houston Smith's discussion of virtue and by 8 new folks around table participating fully. Elaine Richmond addresses the United Methodist Women (UMW) meeting in Portland of 100 people. 'Plain Speaking' intensive finishes with few numbers but good reviews.

Internal: Team meets for Saturday impromptu mid-course correction over against hard numbers and finances and program producing visioning conversation that explores new ways to journey people that will impact the program income.

Contradiction: Integrating new images for a longer range vision while in the midst of quarter tactics and do's that are more immediate. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Preparation for a January VJL is launched with a recruitment trip to San Bernadino, a news release sent to local papers and a mailing prepared for individual prospects. An East Indian in LA offers to host a development luncheon and cocktail party for 300 people with special guest, Gregory Peck at \$50 a plate. RTD contract is completed.

Internal: House renovation continues with transformation happening of the materials and decor closets to organize space! Gregory's week is highlighted by his seventh birthday party.

Contradiction: Planning formation strategy while remaneuvering self-suport strategy. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: The Region begins recruiting the December Vocational Journey Lab through appointments with the Regional Team, mailing list people, and several new people referred by PLC graduate anxious to experience the new course. The Phoenix Police department says "yes" to VJL, promises two participants with eyes open to the possibility of VJL use in police academy as well as interest in LENS. Seventeen say yes in the Region to the VJL in the second week of recruitment.

Internal: Youth picnic with 16 participants and Halloween party with 25 attending creates ways for the Regional Team to participate in the cultural celebration of Halloween with the House.

Contradiction: Planning and visiting which release effective new missional images regarding Native America and IERD. (Week 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Visitors aid in recruiting sponsors and contacts for the RDS. The marketing campaign sparks ideas setting off an explosion of program prospects. The Metro circuiting plan begins to cook up excitement throughout the Region.

Meeting with Mission Chamber of Commerce lays out promotional plan for Chamber planning consultations.

Contradiction: Externalizing efforts to expand the network of Those Who Care.(Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: A marketing-intensive two weeks bags one 'inter-church colloquy' 44 hour weekend for January, swirls 8 organizations onto the 'working stage' and makes clear the necessity of a comparable intensive, stellar follow-up system. Lady Peggy Lindsay's visit charms colleagues, introduces the IERD to a group of guests hosted by Lila McCall at the Houstonian and secures Archbishop Patrick Flores of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of San Antonio for the IERD Global Advisory Board.

Internal: Work goes on full swing with C. Fiske in tech school, L.Zahrt in town 4 out of 5 days, M.Z.Longstreath experiencing a bomb scare at work and N.Griffin (youth) having a job for next week.

Contradiction: Discovering that the game has changed from selling instruments to putting a band together.(Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: The Miami circuit holds strategy meetings using the Naisbitt paper in Colquitt, Orlando, and Tallahassee, and locates a possible RDS co-sponsor in Tallahassee metro Tri-Community Council in Bonifay. Proposals for presentation and funding are mailed to 40 churches. First two PMA sessions held in 3rd training course.

Internal:Self support collegium clarifies sources of funds and RH-13.

Contradiction: Discerning the focused tasks which will keep the momentum going in all areas.(Week 7)*

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: IERD/MAAF excitement builds as old and new contacts are very open in giving names and affirming the trend for events. The Westport Junior High School Advisory Committee is ready to have 'forum' facilitated by ICA. The Norman Center for Career Education proposes that they recruit and sponsor Education for Life workshops and leadership programs for High School students.

Internal: First computer job of the year is completed and flyers distributed for more computer jobs. Ray Knutsen has a photo internship with American Cablevision. Nina Crow visits over weekend, and youth income increases for third consecutive month.

Contradiction: Bringing off Thanksgiving as a great corporate event that honors family, Metro, and House, and having fun doing it. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY-LORIMOR

External: Gene and Iris rush through 33 DADC (Delegate Assurance and Documentation Committees) with interview forms and Midcrest Symposium brochures. Group rate of 'up to five for \$100' promises to break loose numbers from towns and the structures. Lorimor Boosters dinner with a new ten acre farmer who bought his farm sight unseen from Los Angeles pushes Lorimorians to declare cooperation is not a problem when there is a consensus on plan. A planning consultation with Cassaday Refrigeration in Des Moines proves again that reconciliation is our assignment. A Monday callback finds Monday morning implementaries done and a declaration that everyone believes they got their money's worth.

Internal: A corporate family night at Chuck's lounge in Lorimor makes clear why people came from 40 miles around for prime rib. Pluriformity is painful as Shakuntala eats a vegetarian meal of a baked potato and salad bar.

Contradiction: Holding ourselves to realistic bottom-lines so as not to lose sight of the grand prize. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Judy Lindblad is sent out to teach in the Academy. Carmel United Methodist church gives \$350 to Academy for Ethnic Minority Local Church development priority. Former Peace Corp director and ICA friend, Dick Celeste, wins the Governor chair in Ohio by landslide.

Internal: Halloween House Church features one-minute-per-family witnesses on personal or family saints. The House enjoys the visit and clarity of Justin Morrill who assists with House planning as the Lachmans foray into their first circuit of the northern part of the state on a contract to set up Town Meetings for RVI.

Contradiction: Implementation of organizational battle-planning in the midst of heavy contractual obligations and commitments which consume much effort and concentration as some tactics get postponed and regional colleagues experience creative chaos with more fear than fascination. (Week 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Fifth City is impacted by the world this week as 25 students from Adrian College in Wisconsin come to see 5th City and visit the Kemper Building. The Academy workday in 5th City allows 45 global colleagues to expend their care on the roof of the shopping center, painting the outside of the preschool and painting the Chicago Regional Office. The Regional Education Guild meets with Phase I participating from Kemper.

Internal: A development proposal collegium reveals how writing three "boiler plates" on 5th City, Third Decade, The Westside Neighborhood conversation, and Enterprize Zone Research helps to focus clarity on the external mission.

Contradiction: Evoking spirit care that renews in the midst of an overwhelming schedule. (Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: A basic LENS Facilitators course (Kalamazoo) draws sixty - two thirds of whom are new folks: migrant workers, board members, college presidents, Bangor, Hillsdale, Adrian, Four-Towns and Perrysburg citizen groups. The occasion is HDZ marketing and formation event as individuals eagerly reach for methods, groups envision LENS in their structures, and questions raised about the Order.

Internal: The very special 40th birthday of David Dunn is uniquely marked and celebrated with the reading of a newly written poem called 'Being 40', a fantastic dessert, and a corporate ritual of blowing out 40 candles. Roundtable hits home as it plumbs new honesty and depth with 'Exit the Frog Prince.'

Contradiction: Knitting together hunks of the missional activities in visible images of compelling expenditure for each week. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND-INDIANAPOLIS

External: A pilot Vocational Journey Lab is held at Notre Dame University with 36 attending. John Dunne visits the Lab and participates in the Saturday noon exercise. Participants make some minor recommendations as to the construct but generally say it is on target.

Internal: Five families join the House for the Thanksgiving ritual which includes both the Mayflower compact and the Declaration of Independence.

Contradiction: Keeping the comprehensive mission in mind. (Week 7)*

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Marketing trip to Western New York includes nine individual appointments and four group meetings. Doors are opened to the local sector in Rochester and Buffalo with a key referral from the State Division for Housing and Community Renewal. Exciting meeting held with the youthful Board of the Buffalo Energy Project demonstrates ICA methods.

Internal: Excitement in Buffalo and Rochester Metros exemplified by their willingness to meet and their eager questions about the Supervisor's course.

Contradiction: Moving contacts toward program decisions as winter approaches. (Week 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.

External: Computer Paradigm conducts its first computer school with 19 participants and secures an NEC computer dealership. The Richmond circuit discloses program opportunities with the Parish Council of Memorial Chapel in Petersburg and agencies working with refugees in Richmond. Recruitment for RSI and HDI week 9 intensifies across the bi-region.

Internal: Dennis Ogamba leads a collegium on Nigeria and participates in the Computer School. Lease and purchase option are signed on the new facility. Kurt Dahlke makes the swim team at high school

Contradiction: Ensuring the two upcoming courses week 9 and having a neat Thanksgiving discontinuity at the same time. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The Regional Marketing Campaign is launched with a sales training event from business and professional women colleagues, while 50 people attend the 6th session of the Onton Community LENS and organize themselves into six task forces.

Internal: First computer venture contract is signed for \$8,640. The House meets for the first Roundtable of the Quarter.

Contradiction: The window to the future is letting in a lot of cold air. (Week 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON-STARKS

External: The Starks Wreath Company makes its first delivery to a church in Portland. A letter updating the area guardians on the Woodworks think-tank is sent. S.E.C. representatives including Wendy attend a Campaign for Human Development funding application workshop in western Massachusetts while Jim and Judy assist the Bengels with the Old Colony BSA Council Planning Retreat consultation in Falmouth, Massachusetts. Tim does a one-day consultation with the Department of Transportation - State of Maine.

Internal: House prepares for Thanksgiving by collecting a live turkey (won by Robby in raffle), killing it, and preparing it to become the central part of the Thanksgiving Day's feast for the Boston Regional Team; House joins Boston in hearing Betty Friedan talk about her new book.

Contradiction: Getting seven days work done in three.(Week 7)*

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Eleven participants from Ontario are registered for the IERD National Steering Committee LENS, Winnipeg, November 26-29. The urban probe demonstration initiated by Elvie Languido's participation in STOP 103, Anglican Church organization of care for marginal people. \$1750 is received through the mail as the result of previous circuit development work.

Internal: The House celebrates with great happiness the birth at 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, November 13, 1982 of Caryn Joy Knutsen, 9lbs. Ted Farrar is sent out to attend the North American Priors' Meeting and to join the Global Academy faculty.

Contradiction: As the major initiating programme events of the year take place outside the Region (VJL in Ottawa and NSC LENS in Winnipeg), ensuring the care-filled journeying of regional colleagues towards local programmes throughout the year. (Week 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: The Vocational Journey Lab set-up is underway, with a facility located and a 60-person mailing sent out. Circuit to Pembroke Metro is highlighted by a great Roundtable (pot-luck-style) at the home of a regional team member, at the end of which the next one is scheduled in two weeks and everyone is committed to bring one more person. \$2085 is in hand as Annual Appeal cheques come in and programme payment arrives. The Renfrew Co. High School Teachers Professional Development Day is attended with a presentation given to history/geography teachers to do CYF's in schools, resulting in a possible inter-school event. Visits and letters continue for IERD N.S.C. meeting and Development nets another \$340 for Annual Appeal commitments.

Internal: The Team travels to Montreal to join in an Order Day, and returns refreshed from this opportunity for corporate reflection and dialogue with colleagues, with artforms and with another Order - The Congregation of Notre Dame, on the journey of the Order. House more than doubles in size as Links visit for overnight stay, and Michael Shaw spends week, providing support for Development and program visits.

Contradiction: Anticipating the next phase of missional focus in the midst of ensuring victory now.(Weeks 4,5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE MONTREAL External: H.J.M., H.D.I. group decides that a Christmas festival is the master tactic for reconciling and reaching whole community. The Regional Team reaches all Regions through mailing of newsletter, Annual Report and the IERD brochure.

Internal: The Dyson family visit from Indianapolis reveals the 'Community Caretakers project as visible sign of care.

Contradiction: Reinventing the Regionalis while the local and global are in constant flux.(Week 7)*

MEXICO CITY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEXICO CITY**

External: House completes the first draft of Rural Development Strategy and timeline for IERD events. More than 60 people attend the parish leadership training presentation and 21 sign up for a year-long course.

Internal: House hunting intensifies as moving deadline approaches. John Foss is sent out to Guatemala.

Contradiction: Finding a place to live without altering timed objectives.(Week 4)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY

External: IERD visits begin in Guatemala with visit to United Nations Guatemala. In Conacaste 37 villagers from neighboring village appear with hopes and dreams to be realized. Advances are made on drip irrigation project with legal go-ahead on construction of holding tanks and water filter systems. Team writes and starts translation process on first six-month progress report on irrigation project for IADB. Demonstration farm delivers major tomato harvest to market just as prices rise. Preschool sells its pig and takes a trip to zoo with its income from the sale.

Internal: Epley family arrives at project on Independence Day to see parade of cowboys on horseback and then is assigned immediately off to language school.

Contradiction: Training local committees in good financial practices so that they can maintain credibility in the eyes of the public. (Week 5)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON**

External: The ICA holds conversations with UNDP, University of West Indies and Private Sector Organization of Jamaica regarding the National Steering Committee for IERD. Woburn Lawn leadership meets with ICA concerning the upcoming HDTI and the next eight weeks of preparation. The team designs and prints new masthead for Cluster VOICE while holding three village meetings.

Internal: The House sends out the Farr family and David McClesky and holds a PSU on HDTI preparation.

Contradiction: Preparing HDTI and implementation treks with Continental Council, Christmas and New Year's happening.(Week 6)*

LIMA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA**

External: A new IAC brochure is created in Spanish and its printing inked in preparation for the Lindsay's visit. Inked victory of digging tools and wheelbarrows enables the victory of one third of the foundation for the new training being dug in one week. The Foro Brochure is created and first two are set up for a new series of "10 in one day".

Internal: A new workday design focuses corporate power on foundation digging while at the same time four different task arenas are broken open. The fast day releases a deeper understanding of our role as an historical Order in history on behalf of style.

Contradiction: Orchestrating all the troops to cover all the fronts at the same time while keeping everyone engaged in the whole mission.(Week 6)*

Internal: Preparation of a gift of JWM writings as the birthday gift to Jamil Dunia is an address on the whole House.

Contradiction: With the Health Trek and the IERD Trek here and in Columbia, and school beginning - its hard to believe it's effulgence and not too much.(Week 6)*

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO

External: A whirlwind of activities, including 122 people contacted for the IERD, welcomes the Lindsays for two days in Chile. Sixty-five attend a reception at the home of the British Consul and thirty-five attend a reception given by the Holiday Inn. The Advisory Board members from Chile have said they are 'honored to serve'. The Lampa Alcalde (district mayor) and his wife attended both receptions and with fear and fascination have said 'full speed ahead on Lampa'. A foro pedagogy in Sol de Septiembre brings forth new interest in the training methods and the additional participation of three men.

Internal: A fine celebration at the Adobe Restaurant sends the IERD team on its way with a great sample of Chileno food and folklore dances. Roundtable is highlighted this week with participation from Sol colleagues in dialogue with colleagues from Santiago over John Naisbitt's Megatrends: Ten New Directions Transforming Our Lives.

Contradiction: Facing the unlimited possibilities resulting from recent activities without a concrete plan of action.(Weeks 6&7)*

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO

External: The week is dominated by Brazil's first national elections since 1964. Set-up for the Lindsay visit Week 9 continues to progress well with the inkinding of three rooms for four nights at the Rio Sheraton Hotel. In Rio Bonito, five families are selected to be demonstration families for implementing basic health and hygiene programs, and a veterinarian is added to the municipal team. Rio guardian and officer of Commercial Association agrees to host IERD luncheon with top business people to attend. A graduation celebration marks the completion of the crochet course for 15 girls in the community of Bracana. Many crocheted items have been produced for use at home or for sale as a cottage industry.

Internal: Two *churrascos* (BBQ'S) on election day weekend help prepare the House for the end of the year push. House experiences the helpful discontinuity of global Fast day and reflective exercises; and terminates the event with grand *churrasco*.

Contradiction: Scheduling a time to do 1983 keystone visioning before Christmas.(Weeks 6&7)*

GLOBAL NEXUS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Self suport Ventures harvest first and positive responses to mass mailing offering consultancy services. Zambia Prep meeting with Marge Tomlinson gives the symbol of the zone helpful presence.

Internal: With many people on the road (4 in Portugal, 2 in Rome, 1 in Austria) House finds creative ways for both an unexpected Thanksgiving celebration and a three day collegium-evening Think-Tank on Participatory Polity, surprising everyone with new insights for the long-range and immediate mission.

Contradiction: With the Council coming up and the quarter coming to a close the unconsented implementation modes of the two year images create a sense of immediacy. (Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: The first sub-continent participative polity think-tanks are held in Nexus, Hyderabad and Jawale.

Internal: A sendout evening with the Panchayat blows fresh winds of the spirit and six new inkind ceiling fans blow fresh winds of the world through our corporate life.

Contradiction: All-out single pace time design gives the feel of a series of over-lapping protracted campaigns.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Rev. Greg Chan from San Francisco comes by to ask about the ICA and to tell us about his assignment of one-years research in Hong Kong. Management rejoices as OE systems for whole of SEAPAC are completed on the computer.

Internal: New fast day rhythm and experimentation including management's doing of the 'new' canonical hours allows new significance to emerge.

Contradiction: Finding time to do what we have no time to do when doing what we have to do so busily things that need to be done. (Week 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: Evening with the Institute includes a site visit and conversations about sojourning or volunteer opportunities with five people. Horizons Unlimited opens its doors with a Nexus collegium and begins to purchase its own tickets. The first two IBM Personal Computers arrive intensifying the computer conversion timeline.

Internal: The week is bracketed by the celebration of life in Dolores Morrill's 50th birthday recital and the celebration of the completed life of Ellen Rissky.

Contradiction: Daring the tension between the impingement of both planned-for discontinuous shifts and unplanned encounters with final limits in the never ending task of caring for the globe.(Week 9)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum Chicago reports the practical launch of the \$650,000 campaigns. Property sale and personal gift bring in \$75,500. Nexus House blitz held. Brussels reports getting a favourably disposed name and face to relate to the Hague on long standing issue of Dutch government support. We symbolize the leap into new orbit of two new teams of SST and IERD and reorganized files and space for corporate use. The key contradiction lies in the arena of creating releasing models and systematic way of moving development systems and responsibility to the areas to release long-range funding and authorization.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that the IERD moves front and center in all locations as special Task Force is set up in Chicago Nexus. The death of Ellen Risky provides the occasion for rethinking another dimension of our ritual life. Academy moves into decisional week with great International Open House. IERD and Rural Development Symposium are seen as steps towards the initiation of HDZ in all locations as comprehensive focus of our futuric mission. The key contradiction lies in the arena of empowering the New Religious Mode at the same time as the New Social Vehicle.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports from Brussels that members from Operations, Research, and Nairobi form an HDZ trek team in Lamago. A two day economic development module was integrated with the practicum which had significant participation from the zone. Chicago produces Quarter I and October program report including income and expense statement and mails it along with an analysis of the program marketing intensification. Volunteer training program in London clarifies new images for integrated approach to training needed for continent Europe. The key contradiction lies in the arena of holding the long-range futuric vision of strategy in the midst of the immediate demands.

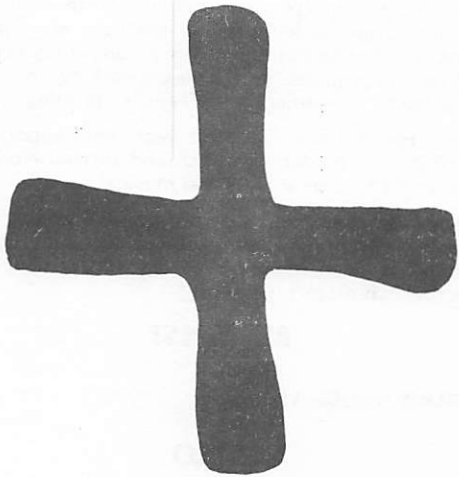
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAMEGO

External: All programs jell into one thrust as the *Grito* is published at the University of Vila Real with inkinded printing; the two-day economic module produces a four-sector plan for small village industries, agro-business commercialization and grape upgrading; Kenya night at the Roundtable allows regional colleagues to dialogue with the trek team, and the Braganca team returns after completing 13 TMs. Contradictions collegium results in breaking loose strategy of cashing in our advantages of the rural cluster, agricultural demonstration, and 15% formation. A trip to the Montalegie demonstration goat farm fills all with new images of animal upgrading and adds an invitation to collaborate with the Ministry of Agriculture. The development team returns from Porti bringing an inkinded video cassette machine.

Internal: The house hosts 23 people including the total Madrid House, for an Economic module and HDZ trek. The total group celebrates Thanksgiving with turkey at a Portugese inn. Movies on the video machine, folk dancing with the Penude dancers and inkinded Mateus wine from the Region make the gathering a celebration.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly to co-ordinate one four-sector thrust out of the HDZ trek so as not to lose momentum with Christmas and HDTI coming.

(Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Eight days of G.C.F.s are done in six villages of the Comarca of Ariza in the Province of Zaragoza, ending with a fine assembly of all six villages. Also, full imaginal leadership training sessions were done each day for the local team, all in Spanish. Spain's two Global Advisory Board members were visited and updated. Barbara and Lucy finish up the second set of seven villages (13 in two weeks) with a grand assembly in Branganca, Northeastern Portugal.

Then Joseph threw himself upon his father, weeping and kissing his face. He ordered the physicians in his service to embalm his father Israel, and they did so, finishing the task in forty days, which was the usual time for embalming.

Internal: Maria Fry and Bill Alerding return from exciting Ariza (Zaragoza) meetings and begin pulling together an Imaginal Education training document for Spanish translation. They also bring a huge box of almonds as a gift from a local Ariza team. Mary Kaye returns from her 3 week European trek for Ohio's Wittenberg University while Sara Lilja prepares for her trip to the Lamego HDZ empowerment trek.

Contradiction: Focusing on new demands on IERD and the Alcorcon set of meetings in the midst of five other time consuming missional demands.(Week 7)

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The Glasgow circuit is completed with visits to old colleagues and new N.S.C. possibilities in addition to calls for W.H.O., LENS, and Volunteer Service Programme. A 15 person Volunteer Orientation Weekend is held with ten who indicate a readiness to continue with the programme as volunteers to the Third World. A budget is submitted to the Laing Construction Co. for the 7,000 already committed for the El Bayad project.

Internal: The House operates with its smallest number since September hosting an equal number of guests on study night, celebrating Thanksgiving American style, and maintaining relationships with inkind vegetable market and bread merchants.

Contradiction: Using the HDZ Event as an occasion for putting a focus on multiplication of options in the external mission.(Week 8)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Team sends out the newsletter with a striking drawing of the photograph of two women (from India brochure) in a gesture of mutual respect, a symbol for the IERD. The House creates broad outlines of a nine month house hunt strategy. A team studies the effects of computers on society.

* NOTE: The * indicates the first printing of a new report.

Internal: M. K. Soderlind's visit, though short, brings significant sharing on IERD support in Spain and brooding on the life of the Order.

Contradiction: Strategically enlarging the nation's steering committee of the IERD. (Week 5)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Events keep the Training Centre busy every day: Third Wave Study, Women's Studies, Teachers' Meeting, Social Change Think Tank, HDZ - RSP.

Internal: Lieve, Herman, and Kenneth turn carpenter and build a collegium table for twenty, giving elbow room and space for dinner guests. Bob Gilbert's slides provide a 'laugh-in' evening and myths fill our Going Sane evening.

Contradiction: Getting the wheels (like money) under the missional vehicle now that the engine is racing. (Week 7)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The participatory polity think tank gives new perspective and excitement to the House relative to all research and the role it can play in our relation to Germany, the future and the world. Two from Frankfurt participate in the Brussels Regional Strategy Event.

Internal: The 'Great Clean Up' includes leaf raking, removal of the renovation scrap heap, installation of a white felt-tip marking board and new lights in the collegium room.

Contradiction: Projection of remaining corporate thinking time of the quarter while having circuits that take house members out of the House for significant parts of that time. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Two volunteer gatherings produce four ready to serve; one wants to volunteer as Alternative Service and does all necessary homework to get the Institute registered as an Alternative Service Agency. HDI followup is designed in the form of a Think Tank on participatory polity and invitations are sent out. Another contact is made for IERD with Leiden University.

Internal: The Wayside Inn opens doors to mysterious photographer Canadian colleague Robert V. for a three day stay. The House delves into an overview on CSI on study night in preparation for expanding the Regional Team Pedagogy context.

Contradiction: Initiating program events when the Regional team is dispersed and details need to be systematized. (Week 7)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

First session of HD-I is held at St Thomas Aquinas Pontificas University with five more to go. Twenty-nine interviews completed for Italy 2000, eleven appointments are set for development and first nibble at an Italian sojourner. Three "Italy 2000" interviews held, one of which reveals deep support for Human Development work in southern Italy. Four new participants in the Italy 2000 meeting. The Jenkins are hosted by Frank and Ruth Archibald on a trip to Naples and Pompeii. First SEM held with four participants; the Marist Brothers request a proposal for funding; calls made on four collegios yield interest in further SMSs this year, and sets up a Human Development Course to begin next Thursday.

Internal: Mary Kay Soderland visits, first Roundtable held and typing for IPALMO (a potential research group) continues for self support. House views a film from "Casa per Il Mezzogiorno", a group which does development in southern Italy, which gives a taste of the area beyond Rome. SEM occasions extensive work on decor.

Contradiction: Nailing down the key tasks and accomplishments in the midst of flurry of activities and a constantly shifting situation. (Weeks 4,5&6)

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: The working group on urban housing is surprised during a ten day practicum by projections that 30% of the future work force will probably operate from their homes with computer terminals, demanding a new perspective in urban housing. Top level appointments are set up with W.H.O., for a new round of negotiations. The team working on "youth in development" has project brief ready for printing.

Internal: For the first time this year, self support breaks through into the black by Nov.30th, and the House celebrates with a wine and cheese party and movies.

Contradiction: Creating the procedures and gathering information for a final Urban Housing working group to be ready for the documentation of the first of nine sectors of the urban research project. (Week 8)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE GIZA — EL BAYAD

External: Cluster leader, Sheik Abdel Hamid, assists in securing a letter from the Markaz(District). The People's Council President affirms the ICA's expansion plan, thus releasing USD 20,000 Ford Foundation grant prior to completing the lengthy routine of a new government contract. Development and inkind blitz, using Cairo guardians and Margreet Farid, results in LE 1000 working. Linen and cutlery committed and guardians following up on plumbing and electrical supplies.

Internal: The auxiliary is soaked as Bayad experiences the worst rain and flash flood anyone can ever remember, leaving 20-25 homes seriously damaged, the road washed out in two places, electrical lines and water pipes broken and three good size lakes in the village.

Contradiction: Succeeding on four two-week maneuvers when we have not broken through to optimum internal organization and troop assignment rationale. (Week 6)

ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Phase I of health surveys, animal disease research and exploration into exporting industry is launched and Phase II of the village re-entry meetings and centre installation is begun. The Director of the National Centre for Economic and Social Research agrees to be on the ICA Board.

Internal: New team member, Marie, an Ivoirian woman who speaks Baoule, gives the team a new facet and added advantage in village health surveys.

Contradiction: Discerning what is necessary in the arena of economic development in order to break open markets while also speeding up the momentum of programmes in progress. (Week 7)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Visits to key guardians strengthen IERD and the second meeting of the IERD National Steering Committee is hosted. Development nets another \$1200 to put on top of last week's largest week of \$5600US. A quick trip to Benin City sets up the follow-up on village cooperatives with the Nigerian Rubber Board.

Internal: House participates in a newsletter mailing blitz as Quarter III vision and planning takes shape. Bells pack for their visa reentry trip to Abidjan and Lee Ferguson wraps up four years of work as he packs for London. Strategy collegiums are capped off with a great 'poverty' muse. The House experiences a great week of collegiums on Research Think Tanks and Order Principles. ICA belongings are moved to new office outpost in Ikoridu in preparation for Lagos House relocation in Orlu in December.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the details of finances, development, communications and IERD so that momentum is maintained on all fronts.

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Circuits to the Diamond of Zambia end with three village assemblies. The result is that three pre-school buildings are under various stages of construction. This was a three week maneuver. Villages industry complex generates K631.00 since September 21st and management team begins to create the systems necessary to run the truck, tractor, maize mill and carpenters smoothly. Women's mat industry sells 80 mats to one hardware store after completing an order for 300 mats delivered to another. Site visits include the Danish Volunteer Service, the Swedish School, Roundtables, YWCA, and Lions Club, with the highlight being the Christian Children's Funds who returned the next day with cameras to take pictures of the pre-school and to promise support in March '83 when their Lusaka office opens. Development reports that K4000 is raised from 15 different donors.

Internal: Rev Muloshi reports on his experience at Academy. The House and village Independence Day celebration (October 24th) results in a chicken feast at Mundewanga Zoo, and occasions laughter as well as thoughtful reflection on the coming year. Sending Danaraj to his new assignment grounds the fact that we are a small team.

Contradiction: Knowing that 'small is beautiful', deciding to continue rather than wait for new arrivals.

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Focus is on bilateral funding as massive local development continues as Swedish Cooperation Society makes a site visit. Norad grant accountability is submitted to the auditor. We receive EEC money. The SCC Board visits Muputi villages and is received with wild success by dancing villagers. A reciprocal interview on radio's "Voice of Kenya" introduces ICA's global work to the general radio public and an invitation is received for a second interview on the IERD. A two day National Project Directors' Meeting pushes all on circuit training and equipping to train village leaders. Swedish Cooperative Society's affirmative evaluation of Muputi Location is received in time for section guns meeting. Three development teams cross like ships in the night with reports of circuits to Eldonet, Makuru, Mombasa, Machakos and Maikuu.

Internal: The House experiences a new form of eight step reflection and up-to-date report on Black Africa by Joseph Slicker on his return from the US and Brussels. The House hosts 68 participants for dinner with Global Film and Kenya slides. 3

Contradiction: Compositing our support functions while half of the House is involved in impact. Weeks 6&7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KABIRO

External: The Construction Guild finally has delivered prepaid timbers and completed roof trusses for the first two classrooms and store room for Adult Education in Phase II of the Demonstration Structure Complex. The Wakulima Guild elects James Odera as its new chairman. While struggling with late payment of teacher salaries the School committee finds it necessary to be strong and willing to act responsibly.

Internal: Kabiro Auxiliary reaches full strength with the arrival of Stanley Shivayilu and his wife Neddy, and promptly disperses with three assigned to the Section meeting and one community person recruited for Health Survey Trek of three weeks.

Contradiction: Moving community groups beyond power/prestige tactics toward comprehension of the servant leader role. (Week 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KALWANI-SHAMALAGO

External: The Section House sends out a team for two weeks to Samutet to train village health caretakers. Four circuiters are on the road setting up for Kakemega three saturation, Hawenga and Kutuni Sub-locations consults. Evaluation of health and agriculture training of auxiliaries and village volunteers for Ford Foundation Grant continues.

Internal: Kenyatta Day celebrated near the new project site visiting Kapenguiria Prison where Kenyatta was detained, the event marking the beginning of the Mau Mau.

Contradiction: Discovering ourselves in the midst of many programs and over extended again. (Week 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-MUGUMOINI

External: New structures and methods address Section B Project Directors and the Muthithi circuiters as preparations are made for the expansion of the Muthithi location toward full Division Cluster Projects. Circuiters take the new two day model for circuiters on the road for the first time. Kaptel Consult is completed with 60 participants throughout the week, almost all of whom are men.

Internal: Three truck loads of timber are inkinded for doors, beds, signboards, chicken house and cupboards and circuit training is held after receiving reports. We receive Dr. Joseph Mbindyo from the Kenyatta University College for the Health Survey Training and then send the interviewers out to three Sub-locations.

Contradiction: Internalizing new methods and new relationships. (Week 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA-KAMWELINI

AREA BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY-MALIWADA

External: Receive Rs873 in hand for Annual Appeal from Aurangabad and the cluster. Gedore Tools Industry from Aurangabad brings 400 boxes of sweets to distribute in the cluster villages and Maliwada. We send 40 letters for the recruitment of Think Tanks to people from Aurangabad.

Internal: House celebrated Divali Festival with lots of fire crackers and oil lamps, and sweets for three days.

Contradiction: Turning promises into money and scheduled programme events. Weeks 6 & 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—CHIKHALE

External: The cluster team pulls in 22 teachers to the preschool teachers training session and shows the Global Film to Chikhale village. Village leaders do a week long shramdan on the Chikhale-Shivkar road. The Block Development Officer sends an invitation to all cluster primary school teachers for an Imaginal Education course. The block team accompanies the Bank of Baroda rural development officers on a field trip into the block, and addresses the Panvel Lions club on the HDZ. The Region Team hosts Mr. Pinto on a site visit and enlists his support for the Annual Appeal. The development team raises several hundred rupees from the cluster villagers for the first time and Rs2000 from the bi-metro.

Internal: The Ashram sends out Heike Albert at the end of her three months of service in health care. The Ashram experiences a profound Roundtable on the function of the Poet with two guests present from the Canara Bank. The auxiliary is sent out for Divali discontinuity.

Contradiction: Creating the new configurations and systems that will allow us to respond to new possibilities. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—VAVIHARSH**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—JAWALE**

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (This is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Estblishing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actuation. (Week 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—MAALE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PUNE—BUDHODA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—SEVAGRAM**

External: The school district holds a tournament of games in Sevagram and the staff hosts many visitors. Rs3000 is raised for Annual Appeal from Nagpur. Bakery accounts for the last six months are completed.

Internal: The kitchen is spruced up with a fine whitewash job and the office re-organized after HDTS is completed.

Contradiction: Creating necessary practical models to enable quick movement after Divali. (Week 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—TEMBURWAHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—DABHAD**

XXX DELHI XXX

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Five leading representatives of Canara Bank, Delhi visit Khore E Sarohi to talk with villagers and confirm their resolve to work directly with us on total village development in the cluster. Annual Appeal nets Rs4750 in hand, Rs15000 committed and Rs1200 in kind. Government of India symbolizes its support of Nava Gram Prayas by giving a 'no objection' letter to the IERD. The national TV crew spends two days in Sikrol filming the village. First village signboard is painted and erected.

Internal: Tribhuwans arrive after continental assignment at HDTI, while Bhoyars leave for Divali discontinuity. The GDC and Panchayat honours the House with their presence. Annual Appeal team enables a fine feast at the Roundtable celebration with chicken and in kind beer.

Contradiction: Deciding we can build the necessary models to make a demonstration of our Internal Life. (Weeks 5&6)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: The Annual Appeal in Bangalore and Hyderabad brings in over 200% of its bottom line (total Rs41,260). Mafatal Plywood gives a Rs15,000 donation and commits Rs60-70,000 per year to the Gunjurpalya cluster. A five page Gunjurpalya newsletter is a great hit with companies and colleagues. Dr. V. Rajan of IDL Trust agrees to be on the Indian Advisory Board and takes us to key contacts for sponsorship. Hyderabad Public School ('best school in the city') says yes to Imaginal Education Course.

Internal: New health system is instituted with separate kitchen water containers and labels. All E.G. now have bus passes simplifying travel practices for school. Jane returns from Sevagram HDTI with an exciting report.

Contradiction: Figuring out how newly found Hyderabad colleagues and our twelve year history in Hyderabad can join forces to release money, programme and IERD. (Weeks 5&7)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: The first HDC of the year is held with 33 bustee workers from nine different communities, out of which come six new guild members. 47 invitation letters are sent to other Regions for participation in the Imaginal Method Academy.

Internal: The House experiences itself as a Global Wayside Inn as nine people drop in for two hours and Japanese colleague Manami arrives and gets oriented to India.

Contradiction: Making week eight death ground. (Week 7)*

SINGAPORE**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: Over 100 people gather for an all-day forum to initiate the Kecamatan Development Committee. Representatives from all four sectors include all government agencies, key provincial agencies, Vice-Rector of the University of N.Sumatra and three staff, the Chamber of Commerce, Lions Clubs, and all the villages in the HDZ.

Internal: The Newkirks visit Namu Rambe, Dan Tuecke visits Medan Region and two sojourners move in.

Contradiction: Commonizing the story that allows ongoing long term trusting relationship with the villages, agencies and companies even when teams rotate and staff changes. (Week 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: The House launches a three week marketing and development campaign. A weekend workday on office systems expands the filing space.

Internal: The House celebrates Deepavalli with two days of visiting relatives and of exchanging of Deepavalli sweets with neighbours. The Newkirks and Carling Reusora arrive from Medan, and Kathleen Tonge, an Irish volunteer, spends three days with us on the way to her assignment in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Creating the working decor that holds us before the Quarter and its campaigns in the midst of the overwhelming details of the daily task. (Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: The first Think Tank in the Region, 'Women's Development in Indonesia', brings together eleven women who have an interview with the first Woman's Minister, Maria Ulfah, in the revolutionary government of 1945-48. The four week Global Language School ends, the first with a private sector company, with promises of more schools this year. The Board of the Institute of Cultural Affairs: Indonesia approves a budget of \$205,000, confirms finance procedures and takes responsibility for raising \$90,000. First week of a two-week development push creates Rp44,000,000 of working money and Research Assembly brochures are mailed

Internal: Tueckes return from Bontoa where one week's work brings great strides towards a new government agreement with the Province. The House creates a live Meditative Council using the meditation game construct from the Academy Ecclesiola Guide. A Week II workday creates a dramatic transformation of House space with enlarged, more functional kitchen, sparkling new-painted office and lounge and new collegium wall and white board. The House welcomes Elizabeth Caperton and Marsha Stansbury for development, and Don Clark to put a new spark under the GRA preparation.

Contradiction: With no registrations in hand, how to ensure participation in the participative polity GRA in only 2½ weeks. (Weeks 6&7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: Discussions with the provincial planning department reveal Governments expectations of ICA and our own Global Strategies coinciding. First draft of the four year plan and budget is completed and presented for further polishing. Bupatti (Local Government Head) submits positive written evaluation to Governor of ICA's activities over the past four years. A week of much table sitting completes a quarterly report, produces exciting constructs for Regional Think Tank, government officers' methods training, and PNP28 LENS followup training modules.

Internal: House is awed with Rochmad's fantastic collegium on Egypt and at the depth of spirit awareness revealed at week's Roundtable. Sojourner, Abdul Majid, leads a Roundtable muse with dramatic skill. 200kg of rice is inkinded and the House car gets a new front floor.

Contradiction: Finding ways to organize assignments to enable the whole task to be completed and each member to experience the next steps on the journey. (Week 6)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: A slide show of life in a Chinese village near Canton presented by a regional colleague, illuminates the social and political changes happening in the midst of China's liberalization.

Internal: Jeanne Glowan's stay to gather research on non-western healing methods provides an opportunity for all sorts of interesting visitors.

Contradiction: Pushing the many possibilities for program through to the catalytic focus that will do them all. (Week 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE:TAIPEI

External: Regional guardian, Bill Wang, joins Gordon and Lucas from the House and Hur Myung Hee from Hong Kong on a one week circuit to Kaohsiung and Hai Ou, visiting ten companies, renewing contacts with colleagues, and participating in the Grand Opening celebration of the new Hai Ou Temple. Two important visits relate to IERD framing. Mr Lin of the Council for Agricultural Planning and Development invites us to take a two to three day tour to visit government sponsored community development projects. Prof. Tseng Hsiao, Chairman of Asia Land Reform and Rural Development Center who, as an expert on the ROC land reform and rural development programs, gives us several references to follow up. Bill Bigelow attends a dinner for Gov. Kit Bond and takes the opportunity to make new development contacts.

Internal: Notification of approval of Joy's L-I visa occasions added measure of gratitude as House celebrates American Thanksgiving with roast chicken with dressing, tossed salad, mashed potatoes and giblet gravy, broccoli and corn-on-the-cob, cranberry sauce and pumpkin pies with whipped cream and cheddar cheese!

Contradiction: Preparing the winning strategy for marketing and IERD that creates an advantage out of the Eastern traditional proprieties and social forms.(Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: An HDZ lab is held in Sudtonggan. Economic and social teams visit four sectors in Cebu. A site visit to Putsan by Don Cramer and Tom Minette from Union Oil includes participation at luncheon held for U.S. Ambassador to Philippines at National Power Corporation compound overlooking Putsan. Development visits include USA and China Chamber of Commerce and an introduction to possible IERD participant groups at an evening in honour of Diatar Group.

Internal: The first draft of a ritual is written in Sudtonggan and assignments made for Zamboanga while the Manila House experiences a mini 'Order' evening, with a Roundtable recollection conversation.

Contradiction: Continuing the integrity of project demonstration phase while moving beyond to redefine our role in national strategy.(Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA-PUTSAN**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: An HDZ Lab is held in Sudtonggan. 20 visits are made to public/private agencies in Cebu/Lapu-lapu. We receive five first aid kits fully stocked for five clinics, and promises of help and advice on marketing, bookkeeping systems, and farming techniques for the rock and craft industry and for the farms, all of this during the anniversary of the Patron Saint of Lapu-lapu.

Internal: Four Regions spend five days in Sudtonggan doing the HDZ Lab and using public and private sector sources in Cebu, with J. Telford and C. Cramer arriving to assist. The House preparation includes new decor, utensils and equipment for the Training Center.

Contradiction: Accelerating new program thrusts while maintaining momentum in existing activities.(Week 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: House welcomes Stephen Leanhouts and Hermenia Banayo for a conference on the new budget. The Carmen Quarterly weighing report is sent to MSSD. House staff joins the Inauguration of new Langub Elementary School Building, and assemblywoman Felicedad Santos is a visitor during that occasion.

Internal: House staff changes assignment for every village worker, for greater effectivity in the project.

Contradiction: Consensing on focused action for the Demonstration Farm and to self-support the Pre-School Teacher. (Week 3)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Mr. Veniboo, Head of UNDP visits the Cheonwon cluster. A team of five travels to SoeSan for health caretaker and nurses' TMs in two locations, with 38 and 33 participants respectively.

Internal: The House celebrates Hannsh's first birthday with a special birthday feast.

Contradiction: Creating the story that allows us to move with available troops.(Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-CHEONG WON

External: The House receives a positive answer about the facility for HDZ. The team gets leaders' approval and agreements in four villages about the need for initiating the DOOP Model, and celebrates with four village Ri Chiefs and Sae Maul leaders.

Internal: The House has a celebration on Thanksgiving Day with the village youth.

Contradiction: Building a clearly targetted necessary mission in the cluster to build a sense of something established before we move into Cheong Ju city.(Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Bob Hanson and Shizuyo Sato are sent out to Okinawa to do five meetings. Joyce Reese and Junko Kondo, Resident Volunteer, work on next weeks' circuit to Southern Kyushu, the first in two years. Our first Think Tank actually works. A fine day ends with variations on an American Thanksgiving Day feast using only a few substitutions for traditional food. (But no Sumo Match can ever replace American Football!)

Internal: Advent House Church helps us remember our roots as House Members affirm 'all is good' including Chicken Pox, Allergy and Sherine James sudden trip to the hospital for an Appendectomy. (She's recovering nicely). Jean Hanson is featured in CITY PARK, a Fukuoka City magazine, with two page pictures and story about her, the family and the ICA.

Contradiction: Taking December a step at a time remembering all the details for at least six major events.(Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Two one-day circuits to three prefectures reveal that team leaders who participated in Town Meeting seven months ago are continuing to meet, and providing leadership to new Life School. Next steps are taken in planning the International Women's Seminar, November 29th, with former GWF forum participants involved.

Internal: Four new people attend Friday Night at the Institute to study What's happening in Asia. Vera and Deann leave for Tokyo to attend long awaited Language Teaching Lab.

Contradiction: Making sure that our Charter Night launches us into the mode of movemental participation.(Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: Membership Charter night on November 13th is a fine celebrative event with 26 members and friends present. Video tape recorder is presented to the House by new member, Kenji Inoue, at the close of Charter Night. A fine Town Meeting in Kurisawa, first visited five years ago with the New Life Movement, sets a solid foundation for further work with that Movement in Hokkaido and future possibilities in Kurisawa. In the Third World Service arena, Manami Kitamura is sent out to Calcutta and Sevagram. A speech on the Philippine work camp is given to Sapporo East Rotary Club by Don Hinkelman.

Internal: Review of the year plan after six weeks shows one third of the year's work is accomplished, and one third started, which gives great impetus for new keystones. Mary LeBlanc and Elaine Butcher give a helpful practical report from English teaching workshop in Tokyo. Many new English classes begin this week, so budget balancing starts to come clear.

Contradiction: Stirring the many pots that have moved to the front burner all at once, now that the membership campaign victory is won.(Week 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Great week of engagement for the Regional Team with Sr. Betty McGee coming from Newcastle for presentation to her Order, the Chapmans and Thomsons working to produce \$1200 inhand for Annual Appeal and \$1000 pledged. Darwin circuit is completed with three labs with Aborigines on Bathurst Island and then a swing across the north to set up a LENS in Cairns.

Internal: Two years of Research is launched with a collegium and a Think Tank that looks through the results of private sector LENS seminars. Murrin Bridge team comes in and Darwin circuit team returns from a six week circuit.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves between manoeuvres with immediate demands to open new arenas before new manoeuvre is built. (Week 6)

Internal: Rory sets into study for final exams. Albert Bellamy brings home an honour certificate for reading. 'Mechanical Wizard' Baker fixes the washing machine yet again.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

Workshop with Education Programme for Unemployed Youth Leaders to decide the focus for January LENS, reveals a great need for method. Global Film show with Adult Education class receives enthusiastic response as Adam and Liza give new possibilities of new vocation.

Internal: Liza Tod and John Rader are welcomed to the first week of New Development circuit and Christina Clark is sent out with a feast of roast lamb and apple pie, and home movies. Training Centre facility search takes on a new seriousness as the team makes eight site visits and Christina leads two extended evening collegiums on Global Priority 7, 'Empowering House Demonstration.'

Contradiction: Providing the context that puts every action in the global perspective. (Weeks 6&7)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: PTS training/Roundtable research with two national agricultural leaders illuminates the vision, contradictions and accomplishments of the primary economic arena for 40 Tongan faculty in training. Bread for the World proposal for USD10,000 submitted by Dr. Havea on Methodist Church of Tonga stationary. 30 development letters for PTS scholarships are sent by the staff to contacts in U.S. and Philippines. Nau'utoka village meeting has 90 participants, Kalonga village meeting has 35. Local orchestrators lead both meetings. Conversation with Church business manager regrounds the hurricane devastation and need for village development. Four guests attend Roundtable and have a group interview with the 40 participants on teachers and the needs for the future in teacher training and development.

Internal: Hong Kong Nexus phone call shares news and data. Invention of the Order collegium deepens consciousness of Order journey and necessity for keeping the practical vision and future story before. PTS priory collegium with Dr. Havea and director of Village Development for Tonga Council of Churches deepens consensus on the next year.

Contradiction: Creating the revolutionary forms and style that allow us to move in the midst of ambiguity about resources. (Week 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: 22 colleagues and friends celebrate at Thanksgiving followed by movies "Chariots of Fire" and "Breaker Morant", leaving the Guild Hall free for a sojourner's family dinner for 25. Task Force mid-quarter evaluation meeting hears reports from the Area Meeting, a special Finance meeting, and the five teams and decides bottom lines for the rest of the Quarter. A solid lead for LENS proposal to Coos Bay Council of Governments arrives from Len Farr with an excited report of Farr's visit to Woburn Lawn and new hopes for further Rotary participation.

Internal: Thanksgiving weekend is an occasion for many overnight guests who participate in the feast; also an occasion for two Phase I birthdays and marathons video events (five movies in three days!).

Contradiction: Catalysing the time and extra troop commitment to produce the many accomplishments demanded of the week. (Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Jasper Mills LENS completes three sessions and combines efforts of Detroit and Atlanta Regional Teams. Gainesville Community Forum is prepared with training of key core group. Development continues with proposal submitted to Harland Co.

Internal: House fills up with sojourners for Thanksgiving and Order Day.

Contradiction: Coordinating time to push marketing effort in Atlanta Metro. (Week 8)*

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Mid America Symposium framing and sponsorship is highlighted by encouraging visits with the mayor of Independence, Mo. and the pastor of one of the largest Protestant congregations in the U.S. Maneuvers and timeline for Westport School community round-up signals new edge of mission.

Internal: Thanksgiving is a great family event as well as a Regional celebration with 46 around the table followed by frisbee football, launching four days of events including movies, pool games, a punk rock dance with four phases participating, and ending with a fine House Church and witness by Greta Hanson.

Contradiction: Shifting into high gear for Youth Symposium and other external tasks. (Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LORIMOR

External: Midcrest Potential Symposium permeates the air with total news coverage in all of the towns, local radio program, phone calls and interviewing across the area. Sally Brown, Lorimor leader, impacts the Kerr Foundation of Oklahoma with stories of Lorimor then and now. A visit to the Department of Social Services results in a request for a LENS Quarter III and their willingness to focus services in the Midcrest HDZ. The Westside communities are hosted in the community center as they look at "The Enterprise Zone". Internal: The House is refreshed by four days of Thanksgiving discontinuity.

Contradiction: Determining the House relationship to the December North American Campaign as it relates to a bottomline figure. (Week 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: A basic LENS Facilitators course (Kalamazoo) draws sixty, two thirds of whom are new folks: migrant workers, board members, college presidents, Bangor, Hillsdale, Adrian, Four-Towns and Perrysburg citizen groups. The occasion is HDZ marketing and formation event as individuals eagerly reach for methods, groups envision LENS in their structures, and questions raised about the Order.

Internal: The very special 40th birthday of David Dunn is uniquely marked and celebrated with the reading of a newly written poem called 'Being 40', a fantastic dessert, and a corporate ritual of blowing out 40 candles. Contradiction: Bringing the money in. (Week 8)*

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Eleven participants from Ontario are registered for the IERD National Steering Committee LENS, Winnipeg, November 26-29. The urban probe demonstration initiated by Elvie Languido's participation in STOP 103, Anglican Church organization of care for marginal people. \$1750 is received through the mail as the result of previous circuit development work.

Internal: The House celebrates with great happiness the birth at 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, November 13, 1982 of Caryn Joy Knutsen, nine lbs. Ted Farrar is sent out to attend the North American Priors' Meeting and to join the Global Academy faculty.

Contradiction: As the major initiating programme events of the year take place outside the Region (VJL in Ottawa and NSC LENS in Winnipeg), ensuring the care-filled journeying of regional colleagues towards local programmes throughout the year. (Week 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: The Vocational Journey Lab set-up is underway, with a facility located and a 60-person mailing sent out. Circuit to Pembroke Metro is highlighted by a great Roundtable (pot-luck-style) at the home of a regional team member, at the end of which the next one is scheduled in two weeks and everyone is committed to bring one more person. \$2085 is in hand as Annual Appeal cheques come in and programme payment arrives. The Cluster team circuits all villages setting up leaders' meetings. The Sectoral team meets with the Urban Development Corporation, receiving an invitation to work with them in Claverty Cottage development. Internal: The House corporate self support venture, the Mobile Movie Theatre, has its best week of profits while the House experiences a new time design and teams.

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO**

External: The week is dominated by Brazil's first national elections since 1964. Set-up for the Lindsay visit Week 9 continues to progress well with the inking of three rooms for four nights at the Rio Sheraton Hotel. External: Self Support Ventures harvest first and positive responses to mass mailing offering consultancy services. Zambia Prep meeting with Marge Tomlinson gives the symbol of the zone helpful presence.

Internal: With many people on the road (four in Portugal, two in Rome, one in Austria) House finds creative ways for both an unexpected Thanksgiving celebration and a three day collegium-evening Think-Tank on Participatory Polity, surprising everyone with new insights for the long-range and immediate mission.

Contradiction: With the Council coming up and the quarter coming to a close the unconsented implementation modes of the two year images create a sense of immediacy. (Week 8)

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that the IERD moves front and center in all locations as special Task Force is set up in Chicago Nexus. The death of Ellen Rissky provides the occasion for rethinking another dimension of our ritual life. Academy moves into decisional week with great International Open House. IERD and Rural Development Symposium are seen as steps towards the initiation of HDZ in all locations as comprehensive focus of our futuric mission. The key contradiction lies in the arena of empowering the New Religious Mode at the same time as the New Social Vehicle.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM
