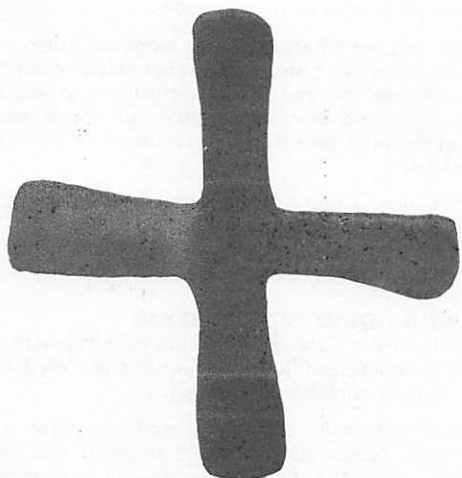


# THE GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

QUARTER II WEEK 1

Oct. 4-Oct.10, 1982



## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LISBON—LAMEGO

External: House travels from Brussels to Madrid for Area Council in newly-acquired car and returns to Lamego for Regional Council where village Cluster, Lamego residents and others from other towns do quarter planning. Highlights include consensus on monthly miracles and spirited folk dancing Saturday eve. Literacy classes and workdays continue while 12 TMs are set up in Bragnaca.

Internal: Stipends arrive in form of 540,000 escudos from Ministry of Labor. Harvest time sends Hortencio to family vineyards and reaps in kind potatoes, tomatoes, onions, grapes and homemade wine.

Contradiction: Writing maneuvers that get everything done. (Week 12)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: House secures two additional members for IERD National Steering Committee. House and Regional Team holds three Special Issues Forums in two Pueblos of Soria Cluster. Several Regional Team members agree to write articles for Regional Newsletter. Local team does LENS demonstration in Spanish for Caja de Ahorros (National Rural Bank in Spain, through which 1/3 of Spain's money circulates) results in 100% affirmation and contacts with members of Cajas in 12 provinces. Two-day visits to mayors and priests in Zaragoza Province villages confirms eight Community Forums for November in geographically contiguous area to Soria Province villages already in actuation.

Internal: House secures five new english classes for self-support and celebrates reception of Patrice Vrona into her intern year. Cathy Bayer arrives from Lamego for LENS and gives a hand with quarterly strategic planning session. Weekend celebration of two birthdays: Bill Allerding and Erik's first.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the phasing of maneuver strategies in order to win on all fronts. (Week 1)\*

*"The LORD said to Gideon, 'The people with you are more than I need to deliver Midian into their hands: Israel will claim the glory for themselves and say that it is their own strength that has given them the victory. ## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The Volunteer Orientation weekend is followed up as letters of recommendation go out to nine H.D.P.'s for ten prospective volunteers and three volunteers finish their training in the House and are sent out to Kenya and India.

Internal: House celebrates a week of 1000 small accomplishments with the creation of commission symbols in the midst of candlelight and ambience.

Contradiction: Balancing the chicken-and-the-egg tension of creating internal structures and doing the mission at the same time. (Week 1)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Invasion of gifted and charming Canadians (some gifted, others charming) enliven the mission, hostelry and external relations. Some nuns sign up for RSI.

Internal: Fasting and local talent produce fabulous French translations of Bultmann and Niebuhr, and gorgeous bilingual priorities in top quality italics.

Contradiction: How to let the teaching, serving and contemplative aspects of our Order's work reinforce rather than undercut each other (postcards welcome). (Week 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Women Studies course is now in second week with good (18) attendance "Centre Feminine" in St. Josse. Week's major emphasis is on the House as "social demonstration" with much papering and painting. Herman Heylens spends a second week on development and Kathy Barton goes to Lagos for LENS.

Internal: Rotational Priorship now happens every seven weeks as Barton is assigned to House till Christmas. Highpoint is hearing Heylen's witness to "unspeakable joy" as House listens to J.W.M. tapes of good old days at weekly celebration and Sunday House meeting.

Contradiction: When everything is possible, defining human and innocent suffering for the eighties and nineties in such a way as to anchor strategy and tactics. (Week 2)\*

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The House experiences the reality of the Holistic Religious House as the first of six weeknight sessions in Social Methods is taught in Ludwigshafen-Oggersheim with 28 people present. The Erlentown Meeting preparation occasions the creation by volunteers and House members of a high-class workshop leaders training guide in German, and internal and external life flow together to the point where one house life guide for the Quarter containing all activity is on people's plates for Roundtable as the result of Quarter planning.

Internal: More sendouts remind House of its service to the globe as Heike leaves to go to Kenya, Wayne is sent to Chicago for the computer PSU, and Connie continues in Brussels on the Religious Orders Annual Appeal.

Contradiction: While experiencing the excitement of a new self-support mode, being caught off-guard by unexpected death ground in every other arena. (Week 13)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Regional Team celebrates a fine 15-person Imaginal Education course, with Netherlands teachers coming from around the country; then takes two nights of the following week to begin building maneuvers for the rest of the year. Another potential volunteer visits the House for an interview and decides to go to an HDP for his student practicum.

Internal: A fresh wind blows in from the future with new possibilities for financial enablement and total troop participation in mission, when the schedule for corporate parenting is posted and the phone begins to ring with requests for English tutoring.

Contradiction: Keeping up the momentum generated by two successful courses when planning and scheduling are overwhelmed by other necessary demands. (Week 1)\*

## ROME

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Two appointments with religious orders seem to sparkle long term in house S.E.M. Initiated Paris-Rome interchange by sending Ilona to teach RSI in French to Paris to help House teach the course.

Internal: House starts preparing for SEM's to be held on 6, 7 November and 4, 5 December by making phone calls for recruitment and sending out SEM brochure with dates for the next six SEMs. House starts SEM pedagogy.

Contradiction: Getting significant commitment to Oct. 16th Italia 2000 volunteer training meeting and to SEM funding. (Week 1)\*

## STOCKHOLM

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: World Health Organization offers staff position of six months in 1983 to gain ICA wisdom in planning. Professor Eric Holst demonstrates interest in urban health research and suggests contacts. Barclays' Bank Manager Peter Watford holds dinner, and his wife decides to become a new member of the Sheelagh.

Internal: House rehab is the focus of the week as Marianne's and Flemming's apartment takes shape.

Contradiction: Constructing a proposal for W.H.O. which will create a new challenge to do our program, as well as make a difference to self-support. (Week 1)\*

## BUDAPEST

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: A circuit to Brugenland and a look over the border into Hungary, reminds us once again that most of Area Budapest is behind the Iron Curtain. Roundtable sees 12 around the table including Campbell and C. Moore from Brussels Nexus and Hannere Golda from Berlin. Invitations to the Fare are sent to Regional people.

Internal: Robert Vibert from Area Montreal arrives in time to help move furniture, prepare wall channels for electric wiring and celebrate the end of the destruction phase and the beginning of the constructive phase of House renovation. House celebrates with Hungarian food and a bottle of Sturn (new wine).

Contradiction: Appropriating House refurbishing as the strategic thrust for this time. (Week 2)\*

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA—EL BAYAD

External: Health Caretakes selection circuits initiate training centre plumbing and floor tiling is half completed. Final two water systems continue to progress.

Internal: National "Holiday" used to plant grass in community centre courtyard and to catch up ICA books through August after the summer slack in management.

Contradiction: Initiating work on NSC when key GAB member and guardian is still out of the country. (Week 1)\*

## ABIDJAN

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

External: Team lays foundations in the public sector and private sector resulting in a contribution from Colgate Palmolive, the gift of 50 chairs, bowls and glasses and five tables and a large book shelf for the cluster training center. Research is done and the proposal is written for installation of a health supplies box, plus the training module in all the villages. A week of preparing for year's work in Brobo Village Development Cluster as the whole House meets with district Deputy and sous-prefet presenting them with the appropriate documentation while desperately looking for a truck to move the whole team and in-kind furnishings as soon as possible. House Writes proposal briefs on Centre for Local Development Village Health Programme and Mobile Training Unit get on a plane to New York in record time to be part of the global AID proposal.

Internal: House ready to receive people with a newly painted kitchen and lounge and refrigerator. Training sessions on the team, conversation leading, the IERD and circuit model enable a new level of competency. We are becoming a team by decision rather than chance. Week of intensified internal life is high-lighted by an initiation of House members into the artform methodology with Guernica and a budget review for September which indicates a rather thought-provoking debt.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between income and budget to keep both the ICA and OE financially solvent. (Week 1)\*

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Second week of development enabled by Human Development Cluster proposal nets \$7,800 working.

Internal: Ritual experiments collegium and Sufi story conversation enliven House spirit. Daniel Okusa brings report from Ghana and returns to recruit volunteers for coming TM sets.

Contradiction: Maintaining the continuity of tactics and maneuvers while honoring Ileya festival (Muslim) and National Holiday. (Week 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

## NAIROBI

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

External: Three days of Area Planning involving representatives of Section Houses and support forces concretizes designs and forums for the coming year in preparation for a two year Corporate Journey Lab and Area Council. Ford Foundation Board of Trustees Meeting in Kenya occasions two site visits (including Rodrigo Botero of Brandt Commission) and a dinner (including a conversation with Robert McNamara about IERD). A phone call from Mauritius Islands colleague sets up a 10 day Consultation with three villages at \$200/day plus expenses.

Internal: Series of collegiums on mass rural mobilization, the Global Order and its third world outcropping, total zonal strategy, and the next four and eight years sparks everyone's imagination in the midst of 14 emerging generation starting their 10-day flying stallion camp.

Contradiction: Taking time to sit and plan the future (Area Council) while running to meet the future moment by moment (post work). (Week 13)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KABIRO**

External: Team forms new linkage as MP in Western Province sponsors two sojourners to learn cement-sisal roofing panel production technique by participating in Kabiro Construction Guild. Women's group sends delegation to District Officer to promote earlier request from Development Committed. Inkind gains timber; cement, sisal fibre and bread. Site visits include group of twenty from Denmark, escorted by Housing Research and Development Unit. University of Nairobi.

Internal: Kabiro Auxiliary invited to Nairobi Area House to present collegium which will stir dialogue re: strategic planning that enables Kabiro to be a community on the Urban Edge of the Kenya Human Development Zone Laboratory.

Contradiction: Anticipating new auxiliary team with last quarter's decimated by weight of, training assignments and discontinuities. (Week 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KALWANI—SHAMALAGO**

External: Momentum of New Village Movement appears as two saturation teams hold Village Meetings in Nandi and Kakamega districts and find that two of the three Division officers already know of our work from Kawangware and Kabiro.

Internal: House spends discontinuous time playing a four-hour baseball game which captures attention of whole village.

Contradiction: Overcoming intrusions of personal interest as opposed to corporate mission. (Week 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—MUGUMOINI**

External: Team completes all sub-location circuits and quarter timeline in Muthithi location. Village completes digging work on Mugumoini community centre's foundation in a workday. More than 300 people participate.

Internal: House sends Mike to Nairobi to prepare for his return journey to Zambia. Consult Team leaves to Kaongo for a sub-location Consult and circuit.

Contradiction: Covering all sub-location circuits with few staff so that we can bring off the external task. (Week 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA—KAMWELANI**

External: Health training graduation certificates arrive for 129 caretakers of Masii location (596 caretakers were trained in Quarter I. Authorization done for Nduluka Cluster Consult (three large villages), and Kilifi division impact (estimated 150 villages) on the coast.

Internal: Kamweleni Training Centre hosts 56 staff from across nation for a council of two-year movement veterans. Section House holds birthday party for Lloyd Philbrook, and Lois Were, both one year old.

Contradiction: Dealing with complex schedule conflicts of a 204 village project. (Week 13)\*

## BOMBAY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA**

External: Two year visit with Chief Executive Officer at his residence builds much better understanding. He promises to sponsor Imaginal Education for the cluster. Gram Sabha report of Aurangabad Teluke is distributed to more government offices. Site visit from Central Government's Rural Development Dept. goes very well. The Training Centre facility is approved which paves the way for self-support teaching job. New registered dairy society meets for first time with government representatives from Aurangabad. Evening stake walk in Maliwada gives clues about how to awaken the teaching village to its task for the cluster.

Internal: Umikant Singh arrives to host government site visit and helps fill in some of the memory gaps for the staff, which gives more objectivity in relation with the village. The week starts with a shock as the Prior is assigned to H.D.T.I. faculty — a big gestalt shift. Construction on experimental solar cooker get both House and village excited.

Contradiction: Overcoming difficulty in social programs participation occasioned by little economic visibility. (Week 1)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—SEVAGRAM**

External: Catalyzes a long awaited transformation of central village park with nine inkind trees and tree guards planted, painted and protected by Sevagram Youth Club. Visits to Cluster villages reveal strong responsiveness to planned Sevagram HDTI.

Internal: House repairs, paints and decors Emerging Generation room, creates curriculum and makes Quarter long assignment of a team to take seriously the 12 emerging generation in its charge. Birthday celebrations give witness to the power of taking life seriously.

Contradiction: Completing models for four sector coordination. (Week 12)\*

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—TEMBHURWAHI**

External: In Tembhurwahi, 150 people plant 600 trees and students plant 75 trees around Primary School. CDA makes strategy to complete Gandhi statue, preschool building and register Youth Manda. the women's Mandal meets and plans to enable health camp and elect a new executive. Local doctor does inkind motorcycle repair. Build Quarter II Actuation timelines in four Cluster villages. A breakthrough on block extension as Larsen and Toubro Co. village improvement officers says yes to Gram Sabhas in his "cluster" and joins the bi-Metro Team.

Internal: Whole Ashram celebrates at Tembhurwahi Sathe Narayam Puja. The forest Guard is a Roundtable guest. Plant shade trees around staff bedrooms.

Contradiction: Moving decisively in the midst of financial uncertainty and adjusting our cluster actuation time design to match farmers' daily timeline. (Week 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR—DAHABAD**

### **DELHI**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Circuit team in Chandigarh picks up letter of approval by Haryana State government for Zone cluster work under Section 35cca of the Income Tax Act. Site visit by Goodyear Co. Supervisors Club leads to excitement about working on Cluster programs. Khori village Panchayat consents to giving plot of land for Cluster Training School.

Internal: Pip and Helen, returning English volunteers, visit House after exciting eight months of working in Maharashtra and touring India.

Contradiction: Awakening people to the importance of training courses for human development. Week 12)\*

### **MADRAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: All expenses paid speaking engagement to 12 nation productivity group in Bangalore generates great interest in the "human factor" approach, the IERD and the ICA methods. Pakistan and Bangladesh representatives suggest that the ICA should begin work in their respective countries. House takes top men from Hyderabad bank on a first class site visit of Nadlapur. Visits and survey work done for joint ICA/Canara Bank village projects 15 kilometres from Hyderabad. Lindsay visit is set up in one day by telephone, including excellent accommodation and chauffeur driven car at no expense.

Internal: Several House members attend opening of new house belonging to regional colleague(K. Samson's mother). House builds portable new room(a la Bombay nexus style) and now has room for all of it's assigned troops. House maneuvers around its lack of a telephone by obtaining the phone numbers of the 24 hour central telegram office, a stone's throw from the house, and prearranging calling times with the Nexus.

Contradiction: Keeping our nerve and our focus when the future, even in its practical dimensions, appears radically open.(Week 12)\*

### **CALCUTTA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: A week of visits to schools and institutions result in 12 Imaginal Education Seminars in Calcutta city. Guild Meeting of the Quarter expands the Host Committee for first IMA CII( Imaginal Methods Academy: Calcutta). Volunteers for set-up elicit Bishop Alan de Lastle's agreement to be on the Host Committee.

Internal: A fine beginning of Quarter Celebration in which whole House is together for the first time in the year. Send out Shankar Jhadov and Chhaya Gauai to Sevagram HDTI.

Contradiction: Naming the key bottom lines for the week that will ensure momentum while redesigning life-support systems and troop configuration for the next two weeks. (Week 1)\*

### **SINGAPORE**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: Eight persons to Tanjung Pura(HDZ) for two days of circuits with three emerging generation—highlighted with a dinner meal conversation in the village with village headman and council men. A meeting is held with key people in four sectors and introduces the new ICA staff.

Internal: Two days of planning comes up with solid concrete six-month maneuvers. House celebrates three birthdays; 29 year old Jim Newkirk, two year old Karl Kristoffer Reusora and 28 year old Carling Reusora. House receive's one sojourner from Telecom office in Medan with two more expected to come join this week and church minister John Hutchinson and wife visits.

Contradiction: Equipping all new staff with information about the Area while creating a solid Quarter II offensive strategy. (Week 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: The Newkirks from Region Medan join the House in conducting a two day Basic Management Training module for Amway (a company using direct sales approach).

Internal: Constricted cash flow is released with the completion of bank account transfers to new signatories.

Contradiction: Transforming living environment and creating the year/quarter's strategy. (Week 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: House sends The L.D. to Ujung Pandang for LENS faculty with PNP 28 2nd LENS. Sends Doris Rettig to a student council planning retreat at Jakarta International School. Nurul Fasri, part of our Regional team makes a proposal to ICA to consult for planning event in Tangerang.

Internal: Nancy Stovell arrives to be part of the faculty for HUFFCO G.L.S. in Jakarta. Emerging Generation and two House members go to Idul Adha as Abraham Issaj ceremony at the mosque and see the killing of many goats and cows, and the meat given to poor people.

Contradiction: Consensing on a regional programmatic thrust to take us beyond a framing and a "Central Office" operating image (Week 12)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Regional Team conducts successful LENS for PNP 28 in Up. Key roles are played by Hussain Ibrahim (Dir. Up Chamber of Commerce), Hras (U.P. Doctor) and Mohamid Yasin, (ICA): LENS team indicates that future programs could be conducted with little Area support. PNP 28 holds a meeting of staff the following day and creates maneuvers T/L. LENS is requested for other division.

Internal: House sends out Nancy Stovell to Jakarta for self support (GLS) and welcomes the The from Jakarta for LENS. Amir and Burham remodel kitchen. House celebrates at local waterfall and tourist centre.

Contradiction: Discerning where the gun is at the head while having to move on ten fronts at the same time. (Week 13)\*

### **HONG KONG**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

External: Year launched on many fronts with Evening at the Institute, development program appointments. \$HK 1,500 deposited and PSU's on Regional Training Centre and Urban district proposal.

Internal: Guardian hosts House at pizza party. House sends out Don Cramer.

Contradiction: Discovering the maneuvers that will deal with long standing contradictions to release the region to move to new tasks. (Week 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: Jamaican Trade Mission visit to Taiwan allows fine conversation with Global Advisory Board member Carlton Alexander. The launching of a major corporation development push gets the whole House on the road and results in \$10,000 in "solid working" category.

Internal: Guardian family, Dr. and Mrs. Paul Hsiao, come to the House and prepare extraordinary German-Chinese dinner and intercultural event featuring animal sounds in different traditions and counting to ten in over 20 languages.

Contradiction: Deciding the major thrust in the midst of as yet broadly defined societal contradictions. (Week 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Zamboanga Del Sur proposal approved by ADAB(Australian gov't) funding of 90,000 A \$ yearly for three years to do village clusters in Mindanao.

Internal: Mini Roundtable rounds up Philippine Gueafee to second weekly house event.

Contradiction: Matching 90,000 A\$ each year for three years. (Week 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

External: Magtu-od HDP demonstrates farm garden is ready to plant. Mssd. Fhanie attends the Philippine Natinal council in Mla. Two people from USAID visit Langub HDP. Flor Rameriz and Priscila Casona, Don and Claudia Cramer, Efrin, Luz Casquijo, Steve Townly, Stephen Leenhouts visit House.

Internal: Baptism of Mr. and Mrs Pamat's daughter, Eula C. Pamat.

Contradiction: Clarifying finding in a new weighing report in Mssd. (Week 1)\*

## **TOKYO**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: A visit to Planned Parent Federation of Korea gives us access to many needed materials for our women's development program. A first visit to Chung Won Cluster by key guardians Dr. Cheong and Dr. Kim results in both excitement in our village work and interest and assistance in the IERD work.

Internal: The three youth begin work at assigned posts--Michelle Jinks in Seoul, helping at intercity preschool, Elena Harper to Chung Wan and Sarah Harper to Yeo Chun.

Contradiction: Moving with development from international to national company support. (Week 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-CHEONG WON**

External: The team holds first Aid Training with village women. The Team participates in youth meeting to help youth group for them to use effective planning method in next meeting. The Team visits friends in four sectors to introduce David Hutcheon and distribute Annual Reports.

Internal: The House builds Quarter II victory timeline.

Contradiction: Creating locally adaptable models in Korean to widen villagers' concern for social, cultural arenas without disappointing their anticipation in economic arena. (Week 13)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: The Rafoses arrive to visit the final Region in our Area. Bishop Jim Mathews and his wife stop nearby for a breakfast visit. Fourteen are present for a Wednesday Advisors' luncheon with the Area Priors. Okinawa circuit in November and four TM's are now scheduled for the Naha Metro. Fall Open House party brings 120 friends, students, advisors and neighbors to a great "four until 10p.m." celebration; live music, furnished by Master of the chuckwagon snack shop and ICA advisor, Hank Sasaki, keeps everyone involved and in high spirits. The possibility of a neighborhood town meeting develops through one of four key calls in the city. Nishi Nihon Industrial Club becomes a member of ICA. Roundtable guests hear about the global work of ICA from Bob and Mrs. Sato.

Internal: Language Labs, new classes, fresh curriculum for the E.G. and new neighborhood English class for children plus balanced ICA books and preparation for the Open House keeps everyone moving and missional.

Contradiction: Coordinating planned and unexpected events in the time slots available for each. (Week 1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Visits to six government staff in Mie Prefecture re-introduces TM program after a three-year absence. Follow-up conversations, after regional planning, on 3rd World Trip and membership charter night lays out specific tasks for the new Quarter.

Internal: Send out Takako Kawamura to Global Academy after a two-week sojourn in the training center. Leadership training collegiums rehearses spirit and practical methods in preparation for House up-front leadership roles.

Contradiction: Finding the new, motivating spirit in the midst of on-going regular events and tasks. (Week1)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

The key contradiction lies in the arena of ongoing interchange among the nexuses to provide motivity for the day-to-day task.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that Chicago's space re-creation occasions a new look and new feel to ongoing tasks and Hong Kong's new filing cabinet allows necessary ordering to begin. Pull together of current financial situation around world enables thoughtful planning for new Quarter when cash flow is tight globally. While one prior from Bonbay goes to Sevagram to do bakery proforma, rest of Centrum does inkind set-up, Kenya ticketing and immigration work and files and records organizations. The key contradiction is consensing on common financial models and coordinating tasks in such a way as to pull together the past Quarter while moving fast into the current Quarter.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that Hong Kong gathers for first time following Area Councils and creates circuit rationale to ensure operations services to all areas. Chicago experiences a breakthrough with configuration cross-centrum task forces which provides images for year's operation in a time of greatly reduced Day I troops. Task forces produced Regional Strategy Practicum contract, faculty tracking tools, Quarter IV evaluation and two course brocures in preparation for Quarter II program intensification. Student House in Chicago hosts three speakers from Uptown and highlights their curriculum on "community" by a Saturday morning Stake walk and breakfast in Uptown. Sevagram HDTI faculty assigned and enroute for training week and one of Bombay teams conducts successful Maliwada Training Center site visit for two government ministers. The key contradiction is celebrating the common victory of having climbed different sides of the mountain with separate accomplishments.

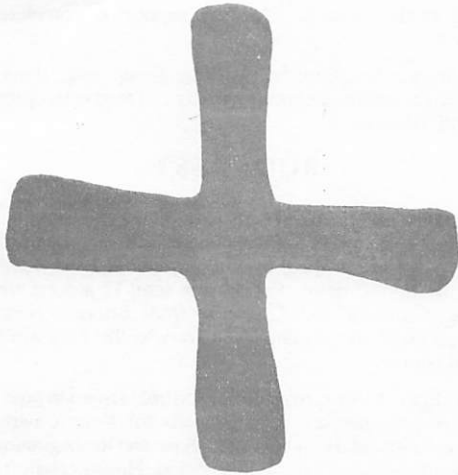
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE MADRID

Several Regional Team members agree to write articles for Regional Newsletter. Local team does LENS demonstration in Spanish for Caja de Ahorros (National Rural Bank in Spain, through which 1/3 of Spain's money circulates) results in 100% affirmation and contacts with members of Cajas in 12 provinces. Two-day visits to mayors and priests in Zaragoza Province villages confirms eight Community Forums for November in geographically contiguous area to Soria Province villages already in actuation.

Internal: House secures five new english classes for self-support and celebrates reception of Patrice Vrona into her intern year. Cathy Bayer arrives from Lamego for LENS and gives a hand with quarterly strategic planning session. Weekend celebration of two birthdays: Bill Allerdig and Erik's first.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the phasing of maneuver strategies in order to win on all fronts. (Week 1)

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE LONDON

External: New format in "True Brit" style (i.e. heavy on jokes) for calendar of events is mailed out to the newly revised participant and prospect list. Volunteer Service Programme mailing to 22 universities in Scotland and Northern England has its first response in two days and four sojourners arrive for four-week training period. A founding member of Intermediate Technology affirms the timeliness of I.E.R.D. and commits herself to participation in the W.H.O. seminar preparations.

Internal: Diversity of House life is shown by the quarterly calendar being completed with a hilarious song and montage. Sojourners add much to bread and market runs with spin offs of jam-making and freezing sessions. A permeator increases her salary whilst shortening her house E.G. budget, and curriculum are launched appropriately and gratefully.

Contradiction: Allowing diverse tasks and assignments to prohibit corporate emphasis on necessary priorities. (Week 2)\*

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE PARIS

External: House representatives see leaders from many religions join candles in a common flame at a meeting with the Dalai Lama of Tibet. A volunteer translates Bultmann's "The Crisis of Faith" and Niebuhr's "The Church as Social Pioneer" into French, and French songs and I.E.R.D. materials arrive from Abidjan.

Internal: House has its first week of breakfast readings from "The Rule of St. Benedict", the first of a series of studies toward Humanizing Technology ("Le Informatisation de la Society" by Nora and Minc), and the first weekly noontime collegium on the subject of an ICA association.

Contradiction: Clarifying the focus of Paris research and its relationship to the other priorities. (Week 1)\*

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE BRUSSELS

External: Women Studies course is now in second week with good (18) attendance "Centre Feminine" in St. Josse. Week's major emphasis is on the House as "social demonstration" with much papering and painting. Herman Heylens spends a second week on development and Kathy Barton goes to Lagos for LENS.

Internal: Rotational Priorship now happens every seven weeks as Barton is assigned to House till Christmas. Highpoint is hearing Heylens's witness to "unspeakable joy" as House listens to J.W.M. tapes of good old days at weekly celebration and Sunday House meeting.

Contradiction: When everything is possible, defining human and innocent suffering for the eighties and nineties in such a way as to anchor strategy and tactics. (Week 2)\*

## FRANKFURT

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE FRANKFURT

External: The House experiences the reality of the Holistic Religious House as the first of six weeknight sessions in Social Methods is taught in Ludwigshafen-Oggersheim with 28 people present. The Erlenbach Town Meeting preparation occasions the creation by volunteers and House members of a high-class workshop leaders training guide in German, and internal and external life flow together to the point where one house life guide for the Quarter containing all activity is on people's plates for Roundtable as the result of Quarter planning.

Internal: More sendouts remind House of its service to the globe as Heike leaves to go to Kenya, Wayne is sent to Chicago for the computer PSU, and Connie continues in Brussels on the Religious Orders Annual Appeal.

Contradiction: While experiencing the excitement of a new self-support mode, being caught off-guard by unexpected death ground in every other arena. (Week 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE AMSTERDAM

External: Regional Team celebrates a fine 15-person Imaginal Education course, with Netherlands teachers coming from around the country; then takes two nights of the following week to begin building maneuvers for the rest of the year. Another potential volunteer visits the House for an interview and decides to go to an HDP for his student practicum.

Internal: A fresh wind blows in from the future with new possibilities for financial enablement and total troop participation in mission, when the schedule for corporate parenting is posted and the phone begins to ring with requests for English tutoring.

Contradiction: Keeping up the momentum generated by two successful courses when planning and scheduling are overwhelmed by other necessary demands. (Week 1)

## ROME

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE ROME

External: Two appointments with religious orders seem to sparkle long term in house S.E.M. Initiated Paris-Rome interchange by sending Ilona to teach RSI in French to Paris to help House teach the course.

Internal: House starts preparing for SEM's to be held on 6, 7 November and 4, 5 December by making phone calls for recruitment and sending out SEM brochure with dates for the next six SEMs. House starts SEM pedagogy.

Contradiction: Getting significant commitment to Oct. 16th Italia 2000 volunteer training meeting and to SEM funding. (Week1)

## STOCKHOLM

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE COPENHAGEN

External: First IERD Steering Committee meeting produces two new colleagues, names four Projects for investigation and documentation, opens new framing networks, gets a commitment from one of Copenhagen's Directorate in Health Planning to participate in our Urban Health Working Group and a request to hear about LENS with a serious eye to doing one. HDZ site is chosen and the team begins data-gathering.

Internal: W.H.O. proposal for self support is completed and submitted.

Contradiction: Creating the working group and Think Tank procedures to utilize all of our methods and to give our program a firm hand. (Week 2)\*

## BUDAPEST

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE VIENNA

External: A circuit to Brugenland and a look over the border into Hungary, reminds us once again that most of Area Budapest is behind the Iron Curtain. Roundtable sees 12 around the table including Campbell and C. Moore from Brussels Nexus and Hannere Golda from Berlin. Invitations to the Fare are sent to Regional people.

Internal: Robert Vibert from Area Montreal arrives in time to help move furniture, prepare wall channels for electric wiring and celebrate the end of the destruction phase and the beginning of the constructive phase of House renovation. House celebrates with Hungarian food and a bottle of Sturm (new wine).

Contradiction: Appropriating House refurbishing as the strategic thrust for this time. (Week 2)

## CAIRO

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE GIZA—EL BAYAD

External: Had an encouraging meeting with Beni Suef government in which we were assured that a new contract for ICA expansion and work for the next two years is a matter of routine procedure.

Internal: House concludes a difficult week of little water for the third straight week and Rebecca's nine hour journey from Cairo to Bayad. The entire staff celebrates its unique existence with a corn roasting party in the courtyard of the partially built Training Centre.

Contradiction: With a proposal working and an HDTI looming on the horizon, releasing the cash flow that ensures completion of the Training Centre in the next four weeks. (Week 2)\*

## ABIDJAN

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE ABIDJAN

External: Team lays foundations in the public sector and private sector resulting in a contribution from Colgate Palmolive, the gift of 50 chairs, bowls and glasses and five tables and a large book shelf for the cluster training center. Research is done and the proposal is written for installation of a health supplies box, plus the training module in all the villages. A week of preparing for year's work in Brobo Village Development Cluster as the whole House meets with district Deputy and sous-prefet presenting them with the appropriate documentation while desperately looking for a truck to move the whole team and in-kind furnishings as soon as possible. House Writes proposal briefs on Centre for Local Development Village Health Programme and Mobile Training Unit get on a plane to New York in record time to be part of the global AID proposal.

Internal: House ready to receive people with a newly painted kitchen and lounge and refrigerator. Training sessions on the team, conversation leading, the IERD and circuit model enable a new level of competency. We are becoming a team by decision rather than chance. Week of intensified internal life is high-lighted by an initiation of House members into the artform methodology with Guernica and a budget review for September which indicates a rather thought-provoking debt.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between income and budget to keep both the ICA and OE financially solvent. (Week 1)

## LAGOS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE LAGOS

External: Development-on-the-road sets N6000 (\$9,000) working and N100 in-hand, plus N250 in-kind. Foluso Longe, guardian colleague agrees to call a meeting of the IERD Steering Committee.

Internal: First Order Day refreshes our spirits and those of our guests, Ruud and Ali Dekkes of Jos, Daniel Okuso of Ghana, and Father Joseph Dayo (who wrote "Rise up Africa" in the 1978 ITI) LENS Pedagogy rehearses the course, clarifies workshops and prepares a team.

Contradiction: Having the courage to trim the development team in order to trian movement leadership on all fronts. (Week 1)\*

## KINSHASA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE LUSAKA

## NAIROBI

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAIROBI

External: The New Village Movement is launched into Quarter II with the completion of Area Council, three Section House meetings and initiating the new sub-location cluster at Kaptel. Linda Alton is sent on the Panchayat trek to Bombay to forge an IERD coordination plan. We rejoice as new EEC money arrives and is deposited. Bernie Woods of the World Bank stops by for a three-hour conversation on rural development.

Internal: Tribal resettlement, a flurry of House and post planning and combined work on the eight steps of the Human Journey are under way for Quarter II as Heike Stamonberger, a volunteer from Germany arrives.

Contradiction: Creating a network of monitoring and accountability for the awesome task that has been launched. (Week 2)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAIROBI—KABIRO

External: Team forms new linkage as MP in Western Province sponsors two sojourners to learn cement-sisal roofing panel production technique by participating in Kabiro Construction Guild. Women's group sends delegation to District Officer to promote earlier request from Development Committed. In-kind gains timber, cement, sisal fibre and bread. Site visits include group of twenty from Denmark, escorted by Housing Research and Development Unit, University of Nairobi.

Internal: Kabiro Auxiliary invited to Nairobi Area House to present collegium which will stir dialogue re: strategic-planning that enables Kabiro to be a community on the Urban Edge of the Kenya Human Development Zone Laboratory.

Contradiction: Anticipating new auxiliary team with last quarter's decimated by weight of, training assignments and discontinuities. (Week 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KALWANI—SHAMALAGO

External: Momentum of New Village Movement appears as two saturation teams hold Village Meetings in Nandi and Kakamega districts and find that two of the three Division officers already know of our work from Kawangware and Kabiro.

Internal: House spends discontinuous time playing a four-hour baseball game which captures attention of whole village.

Contradiction: Overcoming intrusions of personal interest as opposed to corporate mission. (Week 12)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAIROBI—MUGUMOINI

External: Team completes all sub-location circuits and quarter timeline in Muthithi location. Village completes digging work on Mugumoini community centre's foundation in a workday. More than 300 people participate.

Internal: House sends Mike to Nairobi to prepare for his return journey to Zambia. Consult Team leaves to Kaongo for a sub-location Consult and circuit.

Contradiction: Covering all sub-location circuits with few staff so that we can bring off the external task. (Week 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE MOMBASA—KAMWELANI

External: Health training graduation certificates arrive for 129 caretakers of Masii location (596 caretakers were trained in Quarter I. Authorization done for Nduluka Cluster Consult (three large villages), and Kilifi division impact (estimated 150 villeges) on the coast.

Internal: Kamweleni Training Centre hosts 56 staff from across nation for a council of two-year movement veterans. Section House holds birthday party for Lloyd Philbrook, and Lois Were, both one year old.

Contradiction: Dealing with complex schedule conflicts of a 204 village project. (Week 13)

## BOMBAY

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE BOMBAY—MALIWADA

External: Two year visit with Chief Executive Officer at his residence builds much better understanding. He promises to sponsor Imaginal Education for the cluster. Gram Sabha report of Aurangabad Teluke is distributed to more government offices. Site visit from Central Government's Rural Development Dept. goes very well. The Training Centre facility is approved which paves the way for self-support teaching job. New registered dairy society meets for first time with government representatives from Aurangabad. Evening stake walk in Maliwada gives clues about how to awaken the teaching village to its task for the cluster.

Internal: Umikant Singh arrives to host government site visit and helps fill in some of the memory gaps for the staff, which gives more objectivity in relation with the village. The week starts with a shock as the Prior is assigned to H.D.T.I. faculty — a big gestalt shift. Construction on experimental solar cooker get both House and village excited.

Contradiction: Overcoming difficulty in social programs participation occasioned by little economic visibility. (Week 1)

Internal: House repairs, paints and decors Emerging Generation room, creates curriculum and makes Quarter long assignment of a team to take seriously the 12 Emerging Generation in its charge. Birthday celebrations give witness to the power of taking life seriously.

Contradiction: Completing models for four sector coordination. (Week 12)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAGPUR—TEMBHURWAHI**

External: In Tembhurwahi, 150 people plant 600 trees and students plant 75 trees around Primary School. CDA makes strategy to complete Gandhi statue, preschool building and register Youth Manda. The women's Mandal meets and plans to enable health camp and elect a new executive. Local doctor does inkind motorcycle repair. Build Quarter II Actuation timelines in four Cluster villages. A breakthrough on block extension as Larsen and Toubro Co. village improvement officers says yes to Gram Sabhas in his "cluster" and joins the bi-Metro Team.

Internal: Whole Ashram celebrates at Tembhurwahi Sathe Narayam Puja. The forest Guard is a Roundtable guest. Plant shade trees around staff bedrooms.

Contradiction: Moving decisively in the midst of financial uncertainty and adjusting our cluster actuation time design to match farmers' daily timeline. (Week 13)

### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE NAGPUR—DAHABAD**

#### **DELHI**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Circuit team in Chandigarh picks up letter of approval by Haryana State government for Zone Cluster work under Section 35cca of the Income Tax Act. Site visit by Goodyear Co. Supervisors Club leads to excitement about working on Cluster programs. Khori village Panchayat consents to giving plot of land for Cluster Training School.

Internal: Pip and Helen, returning English volunteers, visit House after exciting eight months of working in Maharashtra and touring India.

Contradiction: Awakening people to the importance of training courses for human development. (Week 12)

#### **MADRAS**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: The Secretary for Rural Development State of Karnataka invites ICA: India to work in cluster development in his state and issues orders for all his assistants in the state to give the utmost help to ICA in pursuit of its programmes. Outstanding murals and signs in long lasting enamel paint in Kannada and English transforms the physical appearance of Gunjurpalya and empower people's images as a demonstration village. An occupational therapy lecture in Hyderabad leads to an appointment with the principal of the top school in Hyderabad (Hyderabad Public school) who was in the audience, to discuss doing an Imaginal Education Course with his teachers.

Internal: ICA trained vilagers and ICA/staff in Gunjurpalya take on a group of young men in the village in a spirited "Kabbaddi" match, drawing a large crowd for a festive evening. All E.G. in Hyderabad now attend local school structures, Mary begins part-time self support teaching.

Contradiction: Trusting the momentum that allows us to stretch troops and resources when the dominant mindset is toward consolidation. (Week 1)\*

### **CALCUTTA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: An Imaginal Education Course is held at the Morning Star College (Barrackpore) as part of the annual curriculum for Deacons. Two days of visits for Imaginal Methods Academy II result in three commitments to the Host Committee and three Imaginal Education Seminars. First Bustee Guild meeting of the year results in commitments and a plan for Human Development Course and Quarter III Urban HDTI.

Internal: The final exam reports of children come in with all passing their exams. House has a fine Roundtable with a conversation on our first experiences of responsibility, and a talk/reflection on the third wave.

Contradiction: Keeping structures in place so as to not get overwhelmed by internal demands with six adults on continental assignment. (Week 2)\*

### **SINGAPORE**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN**

External: Provincial authorization visits are made to the Development Agencies (our Gov't counterpart), the Secretary to the Governor, the head of the district and sub-district, and The Health Department of Tanjungpura.

Internal: A conversation is held with three sojourners. Special study of the book "Let's eat right to keep fit" is begun. Send Carmelito to Kuala Lumpur for Visa.

Contradiction: Enabling configuration that allows effective troop movement. (Week 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

External: The Newkirks from Region Medan join the House in conducting a two day Basic Management Training module for Amway (a company using direct sales approach).

Internal: Constricted cash flow is released with the completion of bank account transfers to new signatories.

Contradiction: Transforming living environment and creating the year/quarter's strategy. (Week 13)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

External: Regional program focuses in West Java as invitations are mailed for first Think Tank: "Women's Participation in Development" to be held Week 5. Continental Team begins SEAPAC funding maneuver with the East Asia Pacific Human Development Proposal, LENS marketing and the Indonesian Film Premier funding ever.

Internal: Self-support expands with the first non-government company Global Language School for 20 employees of HUFFCO Corporation in Jakarta staffed by Jakarta and Ujung Pandang Houses. The Tueckes return from Kuala Lumpur as The Training Center is launched with a collegium by Christina Clark and new screens on the lounge windows.

Contradiction: Recreating the internal structures which reflect internal care and external mission. (Week 2)\*

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG**

External: Circuits to Kecamatan villages reveal a substantial increase in the number of hectares to be cultivated for the new rice double-cropping system. Last season's success with this Googarancah system has catalyzed other farmers to try it this year. House attends local Government Health Department meeting and arranges to teach a 10-day local Health Workers Methods Training School. Proposal is submitted to a local cement company for ongoing methods training, towards increasig self-support imcome.

Internal: Whole house experiences the joy of hard labour as one day is spent in cleaning up the office and storeroom, creating a beautiful lounge area and creating a large imaginal battle-planning board for the collegium room.

Contradiction: Finding ways to move major strategies as operational nitty gritty tasks consume more time than expected. (Week 1)\*

## HONG KONG

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Year launched on many fronts with Evening at the Institute, development program appointments. \$HK 1,500 deposited and PSU's on Regional Training Centre and urban district proposal.

Internal: Guardian hosts House at pizza party. House sends out Don Cramer.

Contradiction: Discovering the maneuvers that will deal with long standing contradictions to release the region to move to new tasks. (Week 2)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Several Development calls reveal interest in Chinese consultancy programs and in sending people to the Global Academy in Asia. Team nearly completes Taiwan business consultancy brochure. House sends Bruce Macombe to co-conduct LENS in Manila.

Internal: House digs into national turf to uncover contradictions, sows China research ideas, and celebrates the seventy-first anniversary of the revolution led by Sun Yat-sen.

Contradiction: Creating the concrete programmatic responses that are the bold leap dealing with this society's contradictions and solidifying the missional story. (Week 2)\*

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Adab-Austrian Development Assistance Board approves a \$270,000 three year Project in Zamboanca Del Sur site near Pagadian (to be selected).

Internal: Eight USAID visitors are impacted with the effectiveness of health care sustained by local private/public and volunteer-sector economy in their site visit to Mactan.

Contradiction: Unexpectedness of two new grants "tends to put us in a bit of a sticky wicket". (Week 1)\*

A first visit to Chung Won Cluster by key guardians Dr. Cheong and Dr. Kim results in both excitement in our village work and interest and assistance in the IERD work.

Internal: The three youth begin work at assigned posts--Michelle Jinks in Seoul, helping at intercity preschool, Elena Harper to Chung Wan and Sarah Harper to Yeo Chun.

Contradiction: Moving with development from international to national company support. (Week 1)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL-CHEONG WON

External: The team holds First Aid Training with village women. The Team participates in youth meeting to help youth group for them to use effective planning method in next meeting. The Team visits friends in four sectors to introduce David Hutcheon and distribute Annual Reports.

Internal: The House builds Quarter II victory timeline.

Contradiction: Creating locally adaptable models in Korean to widen villagers' concern for social, cultural arenas without disappointing their anticipation in economic arena. (Week 13)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: The Rafos family is sent out to Tokyo from House Church on Sunday morning after a full week of visits, calls, meetings and events. One highlight of their visit was the Roundtable on Africa and being taught one of the songs from Kenya. Circuits are set now for Saga, Okinawa and Nagasaki.
