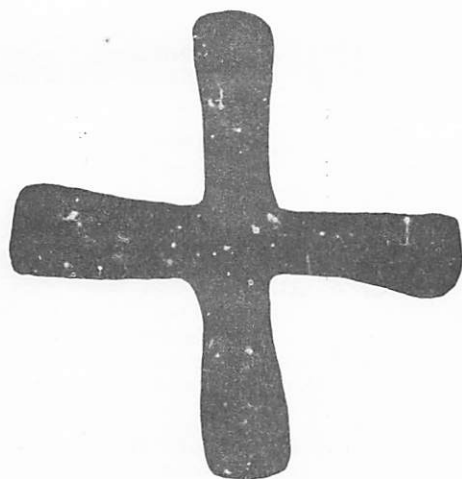

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: House receives annual donations from Arthur Anderson and Essex-Sherring. Send out Carmen Macias to London and Ignacio Velilla to Brussels Nexus for two month volunteer program.

Internal: Welcome Patsy Maguire as sojourner and Blackwell family, Methodist student pastor at University of Chicago, as house guests for several days.

Contradiction: Securing 1982-83 self support and development base now. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LISBON—LAMEGO

External: Fifteen-person-strong public youth force organizes and teaches first two youth forums in Portugal. Workday in Granjo do Tedo takes soil samples and completes baseline data survey. Aldeias raises ESC 130,000 in one-day sports and music celebration to launch construction of Multipurpose Cultural Center. Relva increases number of participants in children's programme to 45.

Internal: New staff arrives. Public youth force receives blue t-shirts with yellow ICA emblems.

Contradiction: Pushing visible sign actuation to point where the villages can look beyond selves. (Wk. 7)*

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Five hundred word rebuttal to previously published articles is accepted and published by **Community Action** - a journal for community workers in U.K. Area/Regional faculty (including Peggy Lindsay) spend two days in pedagogy in preparation for first LENS of new programme year. U.K. foundation commits itself to substantial bi-annual support.

Internal: Typical August week as House prepares for arrival of 2 sojourners, 3 guests, 2 house members, and 2 LENS regional team members in midst of daily summer review sessions to "catch up" on what happened both "in House" and "in Council".

Contradiction: Needing timeline to integrate creatively with active demands in LENS, Volunteers programme, and sojourner training while experiencing great potential awaiting and work needed on facility. (Wk. 8)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Hong Kong colleague, Victor Liu, presents stimulating slide show on China to House and guests. Discontinuity team sends out summer issue of Les Nouvelles on schedule. Prospective volunteer responds to V.O.W. ad in UNESCO publication.

Internal: Budget workshops prove (once again) to be helpful context for depth conversations and imaginative possibilities for House life.

Contradiction: Taking time to ask questions without having questions consume time. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: House member continues permeation of business community by assuming major responsibilities with United Fund Belgium on voluntary basis in order to meet personnel from many multinationals.

Internal: Welcome back Paige and Ajit from North America, Jessica, Daniel, and Aidan from U.K. Welcome Heylens family--Herman, Lieve, Simon, and Pieter--for the year and Jan Joostens (Amsterdam) for weekend. Send out Anna Gowenda (Brussels) after 3-month sojourn, and Birgit Otkar (Hamburg) to Abidjan after one month.

Contradiction: Determining parameters of mission, house life, and individual integrity that manifest revolutionary edge of human development in Belgium and the world. (Wk. 8)*

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Volunteer Orientation Weekend goes well with eight participants and six staff. Four decide to volunteer for 6 months to one year. Revision is sent back to Pro Vobis (German Film Company) of their script for a film on ICA work featuring Volunteer experience in India. Registrations for September Area Council continue to come in from across Germany.

Internal: Wednesday night celebrates eventful week as Patrice finishes work and prepares for internship in Area Madrid, sojourner Fernando Villela from Madrid is sent out to Madrid, and Orhan passes university entrance exams in Turkey and can now study in Germany.

Contradiction: Seeing what can be left hanging loose until this year's team is together while making decisions that use current advantages. (Wk. 7)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: The new brochure, in kind, for the Fall Imaginal Education Course, rolls off the press while 3 days of Regional Team planning meetings put practical wheels under the vision. A mailing goes out to 84 schools in the first marketing barrage and preparations for the next newsletter are completed.

Internal: After commissioning by the Board of Directors and Regional Team, Joyce and Mark Alan are sent out to the GRC.

Contradiction: Taking the necessary discontinuous breath of the Summer and still maintaining the necessary momentum for a scheduled victorious Autumn. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: Evening event launches one more guild on urban health research. World Health Organization invites Marianne to represent Denmark at Salzburg conference on urban youth at which working group of 15 from all Europe will discuss strategies for urban areas. Australian ambassador extends invitation to hear about W.H.O. work. Dr. David Game, president-elect for World Colleges and Academies of Community Medicine, is enthusiastic about work of ICA/WHO and extends invitation to attend conference in Singapore, May 1983. House represented in Cardiff, Wales at course on computer language facilitated admirably by Bristol House.

Internal: Local school evening opens new contacts. E.G. begins first week of school life and is alarmed that they did not even open their books for one whole day.

Contradiction: Re-ordering office to simplify data retrieval for working groups. (Wk. 8)*

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

External: Austrian ICA registration completed with word from Internal Security stating there is no reason why we cannot be registered as benevolent society. Many telephone calls reveal colleagues still dispersed on "urlaub" vacation.

Internal: "Let George Do It" services lead to contract for different House location; highly symbolic fast day spent in closing the deal and new (old) facility will need much "handyman" service.

Contradiction: Maintaining juggling act of program possibilities, self-support and house renovation with limited resources. (Wk. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINIA

External: Old Development contacts release funding LE1400, six tons cement and customs expertise guidance. New volunteer eye doctor screens and treats 45 patients in one afternoon.

Internal: Jim Meyers and Teresa Lingafelter visit to compile back-up on EEC grant accounting and add global presence while Samia Youssef is sent out to USA after four years in Bayad.

Contradiction: Initiating previously funded programme when cash flow and government routine demand immediate action. (Wk. 9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ABIDJAN

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Nigerian Rubber Board sends deposit confirming LENS while four member team does HDI in Abakaliki with 45 Catholic laymen. Trip to Izombe sets up 19 Town Meetings and visit to Professor Udekwu begins transition in mode of self-support.

Internal: Guardian Sharta continues to work on IERD by visiting the house to get data. Return of Lee Ferguson, the arrival of the Bells, and the toasting of the birth of Morufu-Deen Olatunji to Elina and Owoloo on July 26 at 12:47, 8lbs.

Contradiction: Building the time rhythm that focuses the team to gain Qtr II advantage. (Wk. 9)*

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Entourage of 64 government officials headed by the Honourable Mbilishi, MCC., Canadian High Commissioner and IBM chief are entertained by a crowd of 1,500 villagers as the project participates in the much longed for year closing celebration.

Internal: As most of the House goes to Nairobi for Africa Assembly courtesy of airlines and travel agents, Women's Industry Group prepares feast for 200 people.

Contradiction: Learning in the face of praise how not to develop a complacent mindset but move on towards greater horizons. (Wk. 11)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Twenty four ICA health trainees complete second week of intensive health care training by teaching health caretakers classes in Mitaboni Location. New Village Movement receives collegium and Roundtable constructs for the rest of the quarter. Work continues in search for Ford Foundation evaluator and new winning story. Honorable S.A.B. Makdavadi, minister for local government, agrees to be on IERD Board (third cabinet member to sign up.) Hold Village Leadership Institute in Kitandi to initiate new cluster. ICA Nairobi receives signed copy of 1981 audited financial statements.

Internal: Kenya representation at GRC returns with reports from Ghana, North America, and NAME. Christopher Foya travels to Zimbabwe to obtain passport. Send out Oylers to Phoenix Region after 13 years of assignments outside of USA.

Contradiction: Putting wheels under New Village Movement's determination to take more responsibility while economy and new assigned staff are slow to appear. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI — KABIRO

External: Doors and windows in place on new Adult Education Center. Jiko workshop distributes 10 jikos (charcoal stoves) for testing in Kabiro and pays for 98 roofing panels. Clinic advisory board welcomes Rosemary Albright.

Internal: Kabiro clinic has send out tea party and dance for Oyler family with songs in five languages.

Contradiction: Holding together of 8 live-wire guilds by one auxiliary with a complex of proposals and land deals that are pending. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KALWANI SHAMALAGO

External: Permament Secretary of Ministry of Local Government, a Kalwani resident, presents new uniforms to Health Caretakers. Project circuits to Saboti-Naikara and Kituni.

Internal: House replants garden with 80 Sukuma Waiki plants.

Contradiction: Establishing regular circuit rhythm to village, sub-locations, and locations. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MUGUMOINI

External: 122 people graduate from Muthithi V.L.I. CEINWEIN. Volunteer from London demonstrates effectiveness of intensive gardening in three sub-locations with seven leaders. Meeting held in Muthithi cluster project.

Internal: Send a team to V.L.I. in Kaongo and receive a team from Muthithi V.L.I. House goes through GRC opening address and allows global brooding to be released by the group.

Contradiction: Scheduling orientation of new staff to enable new creativity while maintaining existing momentum. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MOMBASA — KAMWELENI

External: External mission only partly slowed by coup attempt. Two VLI's held involving 114 people. Health caretaker training goes on for 35 villages of Iveti location. House calculates that during July at least 1200 village leaders played leadership roles in planning events in Central Division of Machakos. Actuation reports reveal new focus on tree nurseries and earth dams.

Internal: Receive internal life constructs and because presently home each night, able to use a Roundtable a day.

Contradiction: Deciding where to conserve and where to risk in midst of difficult transition period. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — MALIWADA**

External: Team completes 11 of the 20 scheduled team sabhas in Aurangabad taluka, giving new images and excitement to the villages. Newsletters are printed and sent to 80 Guardians who are from all 4 sectors.

Internal: Collegium on women's industries shows possibilities of women's industries in the cluster.

Contradiction: Knowing the facts in order to move effectively on land ownership and women's role. (Wk. 9)*

External: Site visit by Forest Development Corp. Maharashtra Chairman and Balharsha Rotary President Ambaskar and colleagues sets up public, voluntary and local-sector tree planting program. Site visit by Vet. Officer Dr. Raje sets up cattle vaccination camp and visit by Ballarpur Nature Club Secretary Sende sets up movie and mini-orchestra performance in Tembhurwahi. Show Global Film to staff and students of Tera Prem Catholic Mission. Waruv and Independence Day enthusiastically celebrated throughout cluster. Public Trust Officer approves CDA audit; submit tailor-training scheme application to TRYSEM.

Internal: Welcome back three people to Ashram -- Muneshwar from Nagpur, Kolekar from Kolhapur, and Vikas from Warsi. Host Mr. Sende overnight and celebrate Independence Day with fine meal. Three notable collegiums feature Regional Development, HDTI Recruitment, and Life of Ghotama Buddha.

Contradiction: Configuring team so that Cluster Actuation and 4 Sector Relationships momentum will be maintained. (Wk. 6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAGPUR — DAHBAD**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Cluster project actuation continues with work on bank loans for buffaloes, carts, and electrical connections. Goodyear rep is taken on site visit as the company plans assistance. Visit to RDA for loans reveals difficulty in finding monies for camel carts. Visit all 5 villages in cluster to fix dates for training events. Search for Area Council and HDZ facility turns up possibility for quaters and staff.

Internal: Berresfords return to join team now expanded by interns Sri Krishna and Grace Tomar, and team begins 4-day summer review. Dali Mannon and Paul Clements arrive for short sojourns. House hosts new development team of Geoff and Cyprian, and celebrates effective team work by seeing movie, "9 to 5."

Contradiction: Playing the catalyst when more results come in doing the job ourselves. (Wk. 9)*

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Canara Bank in Hyderabad calls to request consultancy help in launching village project near Hyderabad. Article on India in global ICA Annual Report (with prominent feature on Canara Bank and Chikhale Human Development Association) brings request from Chairman of the Bank for 20 additional copies, one for every Board member.

Internal: House begins year of transition towards Bangalore Area House by preparing strong team to send out to Bangalore, and by relocating Hyderabad House in smaller facility. House packs, moves, unpacks, and sets up new house in 36 hours, at cost of six dollars.

Contradiction: Determining the "wood" of strategic focus in midst of "forest" of possibilities, particularly in Bangalore Region. (Wk. 8)*

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: House begins preparation for programme year 82-83 with correspondence to confirm three contacts for Qtr. II. LENS visits confirm Qtr. II schedule and arrange appointments for Sir James Lindsay's visit.

Internal: Ramesh and Chaya Gavai and Sheila Maguire arrive to begin the year. Week is focused on claiming space as individual and corporate house space is transformed into a new ashram.

Contradiction: Creatively using time and resources in preparation for significant Area Council to begin the year. (Wk. 9)*

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Passing baton to newly arrived team continues as visits are made to key colleagues in the public and private sector. LENS confirmed with Ericson Telecoms for September.

Internal: Mark Welch, Sherwood Shankland, Romanus Wau and Mike Hoff join S. Krishnan and V. Dharmalingam as part of transition team. Regional colleagues participate with House in celebration of Friday night. Eric's father visits and accompanies House to Sungai Lui.

Contradiction: Adequately grounding new team in concrete realities of the terrain in order to project new strategies for the future. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN

External: ICA staff joins with Health Department of Kecamatan T. Pura for Health Fair and receives call from PNP VII regarding OLS.

Internal: House receives call from Jakarta regarding new assignment. Great workday prepares for new troops and flag raising for Indonesian Independence Day.

Contradiction: Releasing good old days with brand new look preparing for another long year trip. (Wk.6)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Sherwood Shankland begins exit from Area by introducing Dan and Pat Tuecke around city of Jakarta, even finding time to visit a LENS for the local distributor of TIME/LIFE books. P. T. Tigaraksa.

Internal: In the midst of constant volcanic ash, Ann Duffy-HK, Dharmalingham-KL, and Adrian Rhodes-UP arrive to staff LENS and House hosts ICAI Board meeting and reception to introduce Tuecke's to colleagues.

Contradiction: Pulling Area Prior transition tactics through Area Council preparation task force work. (Wk.9)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG

External: South Sulawesi's largest government agency, the Public Works Dept., schedules LENS for late August or early September. Preparation for initiation of two PZWKSS (women's engagement) projects by Rural Development Dept. (Bangdes) in Kabupaten Maros completed as ICA and Department officials hold meetings in two villages of neighboring Kecamatan to context upcoming preschool demonstration by ICA and Bontoa preschool teachers.

Internal: House makes rounds of Guardians and Bontoa in observance of Muslim Ramadan Holidays, and receives new sojourner, "Burhan," younger brother of Bontoa's headman.

Contradiction: Communicating with distant colleagues to insure appropriate timing and adequate staffing for upcoming programme events. (Wk.6)*

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Strategic Planning Workshop seminar for TWS Enterprises, local Hong Kong company, is successful beginning for new series of regional training programme for business. Citibank commits its first donation for H.K. region.

Internal: Collegiums and House life enlivened by reports from Research Council as Louise returns and we host guests enroute to new assignments. Celebration with sampan ride and sidewalk "cafe" dinner refresh us.

Contradiction: Creating real discontinuity as jobs keep us in the "same old thing" mode. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Metro colleagues visit House to welcome new staff and rehearse with excitement significance of ten year movement history in Taiwan. Office of GTE Taiwan Telecommunications Corporation executive, former LENS participant, calls unexpectedly for information on Management training, signalling new level opportunities to move with respect to ICA Taiwan private sector profile.

Internal: Week II planning session with newly arrived team produces House life models and initial strategic brooding. Sung Chul, Korean colleague, visits en route to Indonesian assignment.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between taking adequate time to plan with new team unfamiliar to situation and moving boldly on significant opportunities immediately at hand. (Wk9)*

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Circuit to Kamakura produces introduction to prefecture official. Time/Life becomes member of Nin-I Dantai. Fumiyo Tabira reports to her sponsoring company, American President Lines, about her years in Malaysia and Indonesia.

Internal: House welcomes Fumiyo Tabira from Malaysia, Mohammed and Elizabeth Jaffer from India and celebrates Mr. Takagi's birthday with strawberry and banana daquiris.

Contradiction: Fielding the financial fouls to keep the fune ('ship' in Japanese) afloat. (Wk.3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Seventeen excited women gather for Symposium on Women's participation in Human Development. Development obtains 75% discount on USA air tickets. Bongdu cluster opens its new treasury in pouring rain with 130 members present.

Internal: Lee Kang Jin family and Lee Jung Rim return from USA.

Contradiction: Focusing general plans into actions. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHEONG WON

External: House distributes 3.3 million won from Dutch Embassy to four villages to support their implementation. MP builds black goat and pig barn to diversify their experimental income source by their own local technicians and labour. GRR builds rabbit barn, HJ2 builds cow barn.

Internal: Griffin family sent out with two village celebrations provided by cluster leaders after their two years of service in Korea.

Contradiction: Building geographical extension plan and extending cluster village consciousness to other villages while villagers require ICA to stay longer. (Wk.8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Roundtable, with 18 present, and Mrs. James from Kuala Lumpur as guest leader speaking about India, is promising beginning of programme activities. Sunday 10-5 Regional Team "Day of Visioning" while Bob in Tokyo is attending a Japan ICA membership meeting, which includes 3 Advisors, 2 guests, all 3 resident volunteers, and ends with rousing half hour of singing, swimming at nearby pool, topped off with fried chicken and beer at House.

Internal: Seasoned with typhoon warnings, wind, and water, first active week of new year is filled with visits from Mr. Hara, former resident volunteer now back from year in Bagdad, collegium reports from Mrs. James on way to Chicago, arrival of Mrs. Sato and her two children, and thorough staff work on preparations for a meaningful demonstration of teamhood.

Contradiction: Putting Global Council work into Regional programme. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: "Two weeks with the ICA" includes 'Third Wave' study, Refugee Camp visit, Third World study, swimming excursion, speech module, charting workshop, and Friday night party at Trebian. Ruth Reames helps with leadership. Variety of new faces participating in one or more workshops make this effective and creative event.

Internal: Vera Ariel arrives and is introduced to the neighborhood by Mrs. Yoshikawa. John Lindstrom sent out to Tokyo for membership meeting. Deann Lindstrom receives certificate after completion of intensive Japanese course, Basic I.

Contradiction: Using reflections on past events and looking forward to planned events in light of long-range training. (Wk. 8)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAPPORO

External: First follow-up call after Sapporo Chamber of Commerce LENS with 27 company presidents and managers reveals interest in doing LENS again next year for same group. Philippines work camp committee has first orientation meeting for new prospects, planned and led by college students who participated in camp last March.

Internal: House is refreshed by new people, new paint and new ideas as Mary LeBlanc arrives from Cleveland, Don returns from Global Council, and Elaine from visiting friends in the USA. Year's plan completed in two-day retreat. House celebrates Carol Butcher's 18th birthday and graduation from high school through correspondence courses.

Contradiction: Learning dynamics of advisor's meetings in a non-English environment. (Wk. 9)*

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: 90 Inkind letters yield 45 Yes's for council food and supplies. In midst of blitz on IK, Brisbane colleague calls to confirm LENS with Sisters of St. Joseph (63 from across state) for December.

Internal: Preparation for Area Council takes House on outing to Boy Scout Camp where floor plans are drawn up and decor laid out. New paint brings life to kitchen and House space is readied for 25 arrivals.

Contradiction: Creating images of gracious hosting in midst of magnus of coordination for Area Council. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MURRIN BRIDGE

External: Circuit to north coast of New South Wales produces profound interest in IERD participation. Murrin Bridge young adults launch sports club aimed at youth engagement.

Internal: Reunion of forces after 2 weeks of dispersion is occasion for celebration.

Contradiction: Creating futuric images to move industries toward self-sufficiency. (Wk. 3)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Leadership Camp for 55 11th year students includes Wall of Wonder and Youth Forum, with all three facilitators surviving the flu which attacked half the students. Speech on Human Factor for Information Technology Week provides high level framing contacts in political and private sectors. Region's second \$1,000-per-year pledger is secured.

Internal: David Jago arrives to help staff camp. Barbara's parents, the Wismars, are sent out after two-week stay. Rory travels to Melbourne for family discontinuity; Joanne, Andrew, and Peter Baker are sent off from the airport to their new assignment in Atlanta. E.C. team "Kangaroo" sees movie *Star Wars* as final corporate celebration.

Internal: LENS Pedagogy is experiment with new coversation method of getting inside of procedures and know how.

Contradiction: Taking advantage of the swamp, rather than getting bogged down in it. (Wk. 1)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA**

External: Salani preschool faculty plans Quarter II and welcomes travellers. Tongan contingent reports successful journey home and Area Council is prepared for with representation expected from 3 nations.

Internal: Bushmans, Whitneys, Ellsworth, and Hawley arrivals are occasion for great rejoicing and opportunity for GRC reports and Area Suva visioning.

Contradiction: Arranging troops, space, and materials to be in the right place at the right time. (Wk. 9)*

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: Regional Team contemplates participation in nine day "Prevention of Nuclear War" events called TARGET SEATTLE scheduled next month, following exciting presentation at Wednesday night Task Force Meeting. Roundtable focuses on creating image for fall planning meeting in a wildly creative brainstorming session on the necessary event to launch year. Total of five potential volunteers emerge through variety of means: Cramer's "passing through" visits; the Gribbles' conversation with friends (in midst of exchanging sales data for the Honda on a busy downtown street); and the visit of a man two years after a slide show presentation, who will be going to Hong Kong to work with the ICA.

Contradiction: Focusing mission in midst of uncertainty about the coming year. (Wk. 6)*

External: Newly formed women's club experiences success with its first project--a no-expense ash floor. Guatemalan company finishes and donates plan to extend village water system to each home. This week's agricultural marketing breaks open new possibilities with different products and different types of preservation. New trees, raffle preparation, fund raising events, and a visit to a Montessori Preschool for preschool teachers of Sol ends an exciting week of activities. 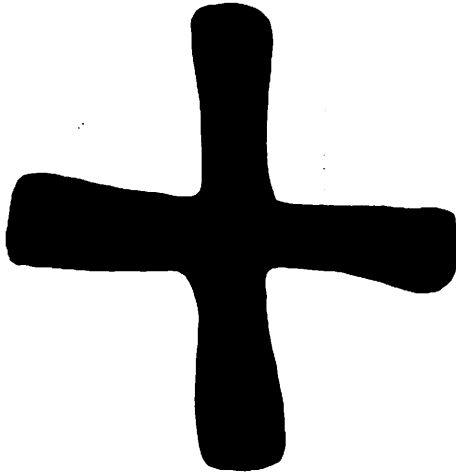

Contradiction: Creatively resolving the tension between individual/corporate demands.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

Internal: Camila Spitz, Uptown taskforce coordinator, begins two week sojourn.

Contradiction: Acquiring the spirit prowess to raise the vocational question effectively in any situation.

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Forty percent of Annual Appeal bottom line raised in first four days on-the-road, including \$1,000 donation from Philadelphia.

Internal: Twenty-four doors delivered toward completion of the New York House facility. First customer for Software House spends a morning exploring possibility of a large contract with the business.

Contradiction: Grasping the depth of past work while making necessary bold moves toward the future.

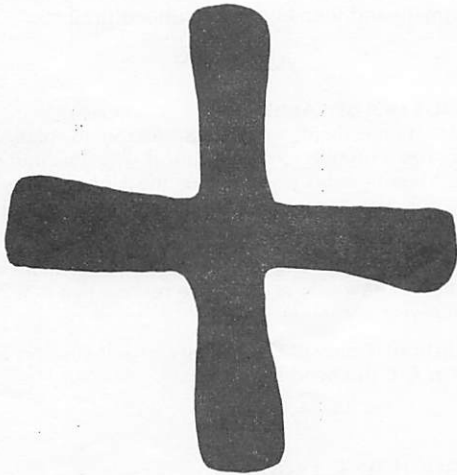

Contradiction: Symbolizing decisions which will allow us to focus the overflowing opportunity in midst of great activity. (Week 12)*

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Three new French colleagues take part in Continental Council at Brussels. Team completes picture book and development proposal on Ivory Coast.

Internal: Whole House returns from Continental Council. The Balms receive first transit visas for France and Switzerland. The children are registered in school. Self support is helped with two boarders, one job confirmed and one job turned down.

Contradiction: Weaving together the 25 global and continental programme councils for the year into practical, cohesive, simple area strategy rather than multitude of thrusts. (Week11)*

STOCKHOLM

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: COPENHAGEN

External: European Centre for Social Welfare, Research and Training invites Marianne to represent Denmark at Salzburg conference on "Youth in Big City areas" at which our "Youth in Development" model is accepted for promotion across Europe. Preliminary working group creates a 2 year Research strategy for implementing primary health care in our HDZ following the launching of working groups in the nine urban sectors. Network contacts are expanded with informal presentation of our work at Australian Ambassador's home.

Internal: House arrives home from Brussels Continental Council to a whirl of local activity and hasty preparation for Area Council.

Contradiction: Being bold enough to prioritize local requirements and hold tension of global and continental demands.

BUDAPEST

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VIENNA

Contradiction: Experiencing triple crunch of maintaining program, self-support and getting necessary work done on "New" facility before being dispossessed from present flat. (Week 11)*

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GIZA—EL BAYAD

External: Sheik Alo leader visits Cairo contact releasing village to move through government routine and initiate building long awaited preschool. Three tons of inkind cement renews Training Centre construction. A week of authorization visits to Beni Suef health agencies is culminated by the submission of a USD 20,000 proposal to Ford Foundation for a Health caretakers programme.

Internal: 1982-83 Area planning initiated with two-day Council highlighted by consensus to win with November HDTI in midst of incredible obstacles. Potential staff strength is brightened with interviews with two potential interns, Mahmoud Abdel Rachied family visiting for two days to discuss the practics of coming on the staff for two years and the arrival of youth Jerome Jayasekra and Mark Rebstock and four month volunteer Patrick Crump.

External: Whole staff journeys to Ijede marking Bell's first visit and encountering a community transformed by a new drainage system, a new state sponsored electric system and radio transmitter, a new school, and a newly surfaced main streets. Conversations with Alhaji Alfina, Archdeacon Ajarji and Bishop Kale catalyze Quarter II planning. Nigerian Rubber Board visit confirms LENS - "Reorganizing small rubber holders into Cooperative Societies," October 12-14.

Internal: Morning collegiums familiarize staff with Council consensus and global models. Internal House assignments are made and Olatunji family celebrates the 40th day of Marafu-Deen's life with missional discontinuity.

Contradiction: Feeling the need to claim our four regions in the face of multiplicity of demands.

New designs give foundations for fourth Advanced Training School curriculum revisions and opening. ICA Nairobi receives invitation from Ford Foundation for dinner and site visit with their Board of Directors which includes Robert McNamara and Former US Ambassador to UN Mr. Donald McHenry.

Internal: Incredible House celebrations mark the sendout of Vinod Taksande and K.K. Tupe to India, the arrivals of Norton family (Bill, Maxine, Felicia, and Theresa), participate in the wedding of Abdalla and Aminah Mwamose. Contradiction: Building the support system to enable spirit dimension in replication.(Week11)*

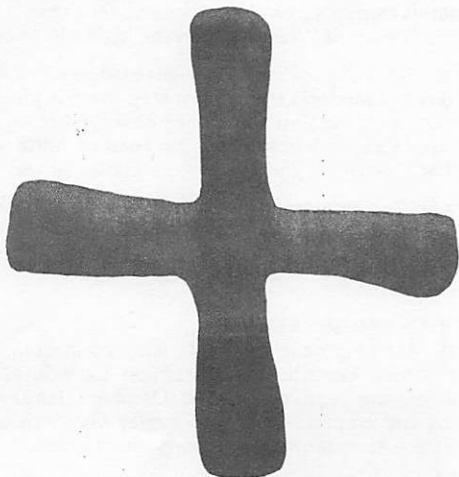

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that Annual Appeal E.T.'s (extra troops) return to Chicago and celebrate having brought in total of \$1,280,982 pledged for year from 1,360 pledgers. Receive Aust. \$15,000 from Australian Development assistance Bureau and U.S. \$6,000 from AMACO for work in Philippines. Australian government formally approves tax exempt status for contributions given to ICA for use outside Australia. Sir Lindsay is chief guest at H.D.A. Chikhale, to garland picture of Gandhi on occasion of birthday. Lindsay and team have fine lunch with entire board of ICICI who are very receptive to proposal of several lakhs of rupees for IERD. In response to midnight messenger Nelson Stover comes to Bombay before dawn to write revision of rotary proposal which is air-freighted to Chicago in time for Sept. 30 deadline. The major contradiction is creating strategic tactics that move us beyond empty pocket syndrome.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum mails Roundtable to all Houses and prepares first draft of Jakarta GRA design for SEAPAC Global Priority to consider, task force work in Chicago transits "Internal Life Guide" into Order Ritual Life. Hong Kong's research maneuvers pull tasks into integrated picture for next four months. Bombay studies IERD documents, projects a year's budget, does baseline data documentation briefing, and compiles forms for social and human surveys. Assigns the New Skills Training task force to Pune trek for facility search and in-kind system to prepare for school. While one prior from Bombay goes to Sevagram to do Bakery proforma, rest of Centrum does in-kind set-up, Kenya ticketing and immigration work and files and records organizations. The key contradiction is consensing on common financial models and coordinating tasks in such a way as to pull together the past quarter while moving fast into the current quarter.
