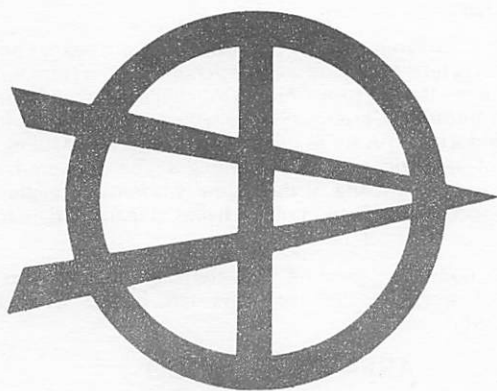

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: A representative of a possible project visits the House and begins next steps for India participation. Bill and Barb visit Portugal to participate in evaluation of year's work and talk through strategies for next year.

Internal: Eneida arrives from Portugal and joins Frank on trip to Brussels for Academy.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum for IERD when everyone is affected by the onset of summer doldrums. (Week 7)

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Training Center construction shifts into fourth year as village carpenters raise the roof, install window frames and start the inside walls, utilizing the expertise of the Portuguese Youth Program to build the bathroom and cement the rocks in the outside walls. A work day in Bigorne with the OTL paints street numbers on all of the houses for the post office. The Volvo is sold the same day the Toyota loses its clutch, leaving the House carless(8). Germans arrive for a month's work camp and add strength to village beautification and Training Center construction in Mezio. Landlord returns for vacation, arranges House contract for following year and gives roofless, doorless, windowless building for Training Center grand possibility. Portuguese Youth Training program brings preschools and youth programs to nine Montemeno mountain villages twice a week. First mural in Mezio is completed on work day combining all forces present(4).

Internal: Paul's architect brother, Pieter, and colleague, Truus, arrive from Holland and Lee Ferguson from London en route to new assignment to add expertise and brute force to Training Center construction (8). Paul returns from Chicago as Ana Maria leaves for a month at Fatima. Two Dutch volunteers, Hugo and Oscar, from last year drop by, adding strength to work force at the right moment (4).

Contradiction: Having Training Center habitable and House moved in within one week while depending on voluntary labor to get the job done. Weaving multitude of languages, cultures, ages and lifestyles into one mighty force to catalyze program actuation. (Weeks 4-8)*

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: The Steering Committee and ICA make IERD project documentation visits to 5 projects, varying from 4-sector working group (for 30,000 people) to Scottish development cooperative. Commonwealth Secretariat commits \$13,000 towards IERD delegate costs of Jamaica, Zambia, Kenya, Malaysia and Nigeria. Diane Schumacher (daughter-in-law of 'Small is Beautiful' author) offers self and car for upcoming IERD project visits.(11) Feedback from Houses on Kingsley IERD endorsement and Volunteer Training memos affirm the catalytic role of interchange. A team of ICA, NSC and the National Farmers' Union dance through first PDL at a Welsh farm focussed on employable skills for youth.(6) Visit to Unilever director secures introduction to International Chamber of Commerce for IERD promotion. House prepares two memos celebrating victory and claiming promises in the arena of the Volunteer Service Programme and the Ben Kingsley endorsement of the IERD, and sends them to every House in the globe. An afternoon of planning reveals the VSP is fully booked for a year of engagement.(5)

Internal: Having paying guests makes August budget and more for the first time ever, as well as making needed facility repairs and cleaning possible.(11) Many faces and places come in and out as £530 is deposited in one week from paying guests, Jon Considine arrives for new assignment, John and Sylvia Francis family is sent out to Wisconsin, Tueckes and Hahns stop by and Clare's relatives visit.(6) In the same week that the largest one-night 'take' from the paying guest programme comes in, a new constraint on our procedure appears in the person of a constable in Victoria Station.(5)

Contradiction: Getting maximum mileage out of current programme without forcing structure in a pivotal week. Building sustaining rhythms which alternate week-long tasks and short bursts of energy. (Weeks 11-6)*

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Mr Stephane Hessel, formerly of Ministry of Cooperation and now concerned with audio-visual communication in France, agrees to be on Global Advisory Board.

Internal: A good look at the Communications Manual which we received in June opens our eyes to possibilities. Reading Samuel Pizar's 'The Human Resource' helps us understand USSR-Europe-USA relations, points to commerce as key to detente, explodes an image of possibility by describing the riches of the continent of Antarctica (look at Peters' projection realizing that Antarctica does by treaty belong to all the nations!), and insists that humanity's first priority is development of the human resource. Pizar is Polish-born, American citizen, international lawyer, living in Paris, closely associated with J-J Servan-Schreiber.

Contradiction: Designing new office space to communicate effectiveness and relevance to ourselves and all comers. (Week 7)*

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

External: Men's group quarter-end evaluation suggests vastly expanded group for next year. IERD inquiries come in.

Internal: Visits with Dick West, Frank & Aimee Hilliard, Don Bushman, Tim Lush and Barbara Barkony continue conversations on the future.

Contradiction: Responding creatively to non-renewable visas. (Week 2)

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: House welcomes Academy grads as they move out from Brussels to see some of Europe and share the story of their eight weeks. Amsterdam Region circuit to attend IERD Steering Committee meeting and regional team meeting starts dialogue over form of ICA when Order is no longer resident in Amsterdam. Project visitation circuit involves House and members of NSC in northern Frankfurt Region.(9) The globe came to the House as it hosted Kang Byang Hoon from Korea and one of Sapporo's English students, Mr. Itagaiki. IERD funding proposals took up the lion's share of the House's time.(6)

Internal: Unexpected plans of the city to use a part of the backyard force us to harvest some of our green tomatoes and pumpkins and to make relish and jelly and celebrate the abundance of the garden.(9) The training dynamic became real in the form of one more person to the Academy for a module of training, and Jorg Mayer completing his second week of sojourning in the House.(6)

Contradiction: Creating a way to focus our corporate mind on the coming year in the midst of diffused individual tasks. Allowing the story that 'We can't plan until after the Academy' to block significant action relative to self-support. (Weeks 6-9)*

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: Lady Peggy Lindsay's visit expands the IERD/NSC frame and context with 11 calls in two days covering all sectors. Last minute Academy enlistment calling elicits four participants.

Internal: Week is highlighted by celebrations as House participates in colleague's birthday party in Amsterdam and board chairman, Jan Joosten, hosts an end of year celebration at the House with a rijstafle while Roundtable is celebration of community as guests and House ground "networking" in their own lives.

Contradiction: Pouring the concrete for the next steps when the forms are not in place. (Week 11)*

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: Divine Word Fathers (SVD) confirm contribution of \$50,000. Plans for two Rural Development Symposia (October 8 and 15) are made. Schedule for year's Seminars for Effective Mission is set and ready to be printed. First draft of 'La Voce d'Italia' Italian translation is typed.

Internal: E. G. camp and July Council reports are heard upon the return of Jerry Bayer and the three children from Frankfurt, and Maureen Jenkins from Chicago. Michelle Balm celebrates her fifth birthday. Correspondence typing job resumes with research doctor.(7) A series of helpful collegiums enabling a gestalt of strategic questions needing to be answered at council and the sharing of the Balms' wisdom on religious orders precedes finalization of the Balms' departure date for India.(8)

Contradiction: Anticipating and thinking through three weeks of work in the few days left before Council. (Weeks 7&8)*

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

External: Letter from WHO head office in Geneva finally confirms IERD co-sponsorship and outlines working relationships for ICA-WHO for the next two years. D'Souza, Jennings-Teats and Banks rendezvous in Oslo to refute academic's report from India, and establish a new and better working relationship with NORAD. Health core meets to establish structure for on-going work in Stockholm and Copenhagen.

Internal: Flemming Baasch (7 years) flies home alone from Frankfurt E. G. camp after a stimulating encounter with the global.

Contradiction: Forming a self-support model which really works in a nation undergoing economic surgery. (Week 5)*

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: The second Austrian NSC meeting is chaired by G. Plank. Project Description Form 1 has been translated and is ready for mailing to some 100 organizations and known projects. RDS facility and date confirmed for October. Colleagues Jean and Bob Watts join House for a day of work on office records and celebration.(7) 130 Form 1's for Project identification sent to Austrian individuals and agencies along with October RDS announcement. Two RDS registrations come back by return mail and six Academy participants to and from Academy share their journey to make Collegium a real event.(10)

Internal: Ruth returns from Summer Program in time to host Sujate Achrekar, guardian from India, and Ed and Greta Macias from California.(7) House becomes International Centre with Rumanian family of four living in for 3 weeks plus Academy grads from Japan, Indonesia and USA plus families from Nexus and Frankfurt on discontinuity.(10)

Contradiction: Attempting to gain IERD momentum with most NSC members still seriously engaged in extended holiday. Enabling NSC members to move from IERD as a 'good idea' to seeing the cruciality of the task for Austria and the Globe. (Weeks 7-10)*

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: Tismat Village Meeting setup continues while staff work directly through government offices. New year begins with LE600 deposited from Mobil Oil.(8) There is a village meeting with 25 leaders in West Bank Tismat. Baby-washing demonstration meets with strong resistance as well as profound interest.(10)

Internal: Planning for finances and working through year highlighted by receiving two new women into House and hosting David Hicks and friends from UK.(8) Fardos Youssef returns from Academy to week of celebrations: Said Riskalla and Nadia Bushurub wedding, Sarah born to Margaret and Atif Yacob, Joseph Powell celebrates his fifth birthday and Powells their twentieth anniversary.(10)

Contradiction: Breaking open solid recruitment for HDTI in October. Finalizing year's plan when dependent upon government timeline. (Weeks 8-10)*

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: IERD mailing prepared. Cluster operations manual written. Contact with Phillips Petroleum renewed.(8) Bill and Andy Parker go to Brobo. Marie is sent out and Jacques is received as an intern.(9)

Internal: The team begins to gather and celebrates year with dinner and a movie.(8) Celebration marks return of Bill and Andy Parker from Brobo with readings from E. B. White and reports.(9)

Contradiction: Getting a clear comprehensive plan of the next three months. In the midst of starting the year, dealing with the ambiguity of the money and troop situation. (Weeks 8&9)*

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Project visitation team in Jos Region, sponsored by Plateau State Ministry of Rural Development, joins ICA to look at six projects for possible IERD documentation; the six members of the team represent four sectors.

Internal: House celebrates completion of 1981 ICA Finance Statement by Arthur Young, Osindero and Moret, and secures inked commitment.

Contradiction: Daring to discern the long range collegial structure that builds and sustains the Movement while enmeshed in implementing IERD. (Week 10)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: 10,000 blocks are made at Kasalu preschool after the Advisory Board decision to build new preschool facilities. The mission was highlighted by three NSC subcommittee meetings with a dinner dance and guest speaker, the Hon. Dr. Mapita, as a fund-raising event toward IERD. Kapini feature article creates great impression on development blitz.(3) Ministry of Health accepts \$10,000 proposal for piped water to health clinic and ICA residence, LONRHO comes for site visit and agrees to consider training for welding, and 28 visits are done for advertising booklet, a fund-raising venture.(4) The development team divides into two groups, one going to the Copperbelt while the other remains in Lusaka. KS 1101.00 is raised. The Minister of Decentralization and State, Mrs. Mavis Mupunda, visits Kosalu preschool, and the Rotary makes a special visit to KHDP.(5) Two week preschool teachers training

is arranged with Zambia Preschool Association for twelve Diamond teachers. Participation in Seventh Day Adventist camp meeting and funeral of local leader reminds us of the importance of participation in the local symbolic life. Phone call to Harare, Zimbabwe, sets up NSC meeting.(6) Second NSC meeting is held in preparation for RDS. Highlight is five Zambian delegate fees have been deposited by Ford Foundation. Nine Diamond preschool teachers are confirmed for Zambia Preschool Association training to be held at Kapini Training Centre.(7)

Internal: Job offer from International School gives first solid possibility of self-support in two years. Collegium on 'Principles of Zambian Humanism' helps everyone understand the basis of forming this nation.(3) Studying the paper, 'The Learning Organization,' and the image of 'fit' between the village, ICA and programmes helps clarify our role as a catalyst. Whole house attends annual agricultural show to see the progress and potential in Zambia. New social contacts are made at an evening with the Caledonian Society (Scots).(4) We have three people on the road in the Copperbelt, and three at bases, so with smaller configurations we are pleased to cover all the bases.(5) Visitor from England drops in to visit his friend who is volunteering for six months. Collegium on Nairobi paper of four sector's relationship gives us fresh images for our work in Zambia.(6) Ian Kaayo's return from Chicago and Ed Dillinger's arrival from US, and two International School of Lusaka positions give new life while villager/ICA watchman Jackson's unexpected death solemnizes the community.(7)

Contradiction: Meeting death ground goals with deadline that needs one quarter timeline with only two weeks while keeping programme plates spinning with half the number of troops and keeping on top of details in a new fund-raising venture and NSC subcommittee to crack the cash-flow situation. (Weeks 3-7)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: National project directors meet in Kamweleni to review past quarter and plan curriculum for village leaders' training and health auxiliary training. IERD National Steering Committee meets to review final selection process as well as receive the W.H.O. representative as new NSC member. Barclays International Development Fund representative visits and agrees to write proposal to support our village management training work (9). IERD site visits to Iveti, South Mbonni and Amraf provide opportunities for communication with Freedom from Hunger (Meals for Millions), CIDA and Amraf which opens up future for IERD programme in development. Barclay International had a site visit to Kabiru and discovered possibilities of being engaged in funding new village movement projects. It was a week filled with intensive preparation and anticipation of the national project directors meeting (8). Troops disperse to cover two village leaders conferences at opposite ends of country. Positive contacts with CIDA, NORAD, Ministry of Health, FINAID, and Aga Khan Foundation point to rosy financial future. Phone is disconnected but sale of generator keeps electricity on (7). Meeting with new UNDP representative reviews IERD, uncovering his vision of massive national campaigns coming out of the IERD which parallels the arrival of Brussels letters of support from FAO and WHO. Film maker, Andre Waksman, has two meetings with ICA to discuss a movie he is making for UNDP, UNICEF and WHO on malnutrition. Two people are sent out to attend major health event in Mugumoini with health caretakers and district health people (6). Swedish Co-operative Centre, Ford Foundation, and Brooke Bond accountability begun with task force going through all the vouchers of 1982 and submitting accountability for EEC with pleasant surprise of being asked 'When are you submitting again?' The first residential location-wide Health School is held

with resounding affirmation of the 17 graduates. Inking continues to sparkle with tea and paper plus selling 100 blankets and chainsaw for 5,000 KSH (5). ICA signs Ford Foundation grant for \$US30,000 to send 15 delegates to IERD from Zambia, Zimbabwe and Kenya and have all-day SIDA site visit, discussions and meeting with Ministry of Agriculture to give form to bi-lateral project. First draft of report for Mauritius national consultancy and proposal for next trip in November mailed to Mauritius as first step. Printing and materials blitz provides 7 manuals totalling 20,000 pages (4)

Internal: Brian Townley arrives in time to witness moving masses of guests to and from Kamwelini and the return of the E.G. from their 4 week camp (9). Hubert Fulkerson's collegium (from India's New Skills Training School) and Doug Wilson (from G.P.C.) refresh House with Global stories as two new volunteers arrive from U.K. and Maria and Lara Dillinger arrive on their way to Zambia (8). Three new volunteers from Holland and USA arrive at the same time as Betty Lewis returns from Italy and E.G. camp moves to third week with carnival, 'Wonder of our Time' (7). Review of Priors' Council work with special focus on the new songs enabled by Linda Alton's return as we receive 2 Dutch and one American volunteer and Ed Dillinger on short layover on way to Zambia (6). Penny Portman returns from 4 continent trip in time for House celebration which takes us all on a journey of global images (5). House captivated by study of Nigeria and African folk lore as Norton's parents visit Kawangware on African safari (4).

Contradiction: Careful thinking through of area strategies in the light of global demands beginning to appear on the horizon. Avoiding experience of frenzied activity in the midst of overwhelming immediate demands. (Weeks 4-9)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: This is a week of many site visits from Freedom from Hunger, introducing rabbit raising to the families doing intensive gardens; USAID, funding the breast feeding health training programme; and Barclays Bank, considering general funding of the New Village Movement. Six volunteer village health caretakers from Katina (1), Muslim (2), Kawangware (2) and Kamitha (1) all in Kawangware sub-location complete two months of intensive health training and are prepared to work with the Kabiro Clinic for 6 months to improve health training in their village. Kabiro staff participates in Ndimi Consult in Keranyaga District, location impact in Kigumo Division, Murang'aa District, and the New Skills Training School in Sevagram, India.

Internal: Hubert returns from India while Sam returns from Ndimi and leaves for Project Directors' meeting and Jeremiah returns from Kigumo and leaves for Kikera as all celebrate using the new gas cooker.

Contradiction: How to maintain the momentum of development when all meetings must be legally approved until after the elections on 26 Sept '83. (Week 8)*

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Authorization and site selection done for newest district project and for 4th division project in Kakamega District. Sidikho Sub-Location marks completion of cluster consults in Bunyala as location Assembly date is set. Kabodho West consult transforms Kusa HDP into a cluster project, leaving only one HDP left in Section, Saboti House.

Internal: All 3 Section priors meet for week 'at home' for Kalwani House monitoring trek and host great Saturday night drama and 'reconciliation' disco. House purchases lumber and makes beds for all, making this a real home. Russell White arrives and jumps into swirl of engagement opportunities.

Contradiction: Getting engaged into full rhythm of Week I circuiting and Week II internal life designs. (Weeks 3-6)*

NAIROBI—THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: Another great week of preparation is completed with Kigumo location impact set-up bringing out crowds of villagers for a fantastic Harambe in Mugumoini at which the ICA is invited to sing. 500 bricks are secured in Khigaki (a Sub-location) for bridge construction.(5) Village Leaders' Conference dominates the scene as circuiters cover three locations with announcement flyers and the Division Officer agrees to speak at the closing. Kaharo Sub-Location Health Training turns out 25 new health caretakers.(4)

Internal: Mugumoini House becomes an international gathering place with guests from Nairobi, Holland, USA and Nyakora. The spirit of the House is told by the victory against a local football team and participation in a 12 hour workday to complete the Community Center floor.(5) Location guns focus their attention on circuits to five locations creating a quartr circuit schedule.(4)

Contradiction: Running into anxiety of Government officers with more events being cancelled. Unclear leadership roles for village leaders. (Weeks 5 & 4)*

MOMBASA—THE KAMWELENI HOUSE

External: House sends J. Kioko to participate in GRA for three weeks. It is a tremendous success with sixteen countries. In Week 13 Paul follows James to attend the Area Council. The two Auxilliary report back after the long journey with great hope towards future strategies in multiple community development. Sub-Location work has 300 participants working on road repair.

Internal: Auxilliary demonstration farm completes planting two kind of vegetables, and agricultural guild members receive share from the remaining nursery seedlings. House celebrates feast invited by Mr. Koja Swalehe during closing of their Muslim fasting.

Contradiction: Setting up next Quarter circuit in the midst of government election campaign. (Week 2)

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: Ashram celebrates India's 36th Independence Day with villagers on August 15th. On the same day we celebrate the cultural celebration, Saint Sawata Mali, which honours the establishment of the Mali Society. Tap water for future community centre was installed.

Internal: Council team arrives in Maliwada and starts preparation. House starts Ashram garden to supplement budget. D.P. Kolankar starts teaching practice in Deogiri High School to get his teaching certificate towards starting a class in Aurangabad next year.

Contradiction: Engaging ourselves and village leaders to prepare for Continental Council and cluster programme on time. (Week 8)*

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Economic module is initiated in the cluster; representatives visit RCF Co. and Jawale Industry Exhibits; Ambar Charkha programme is on computer. Training Centre and Chikhale bridge construction continue; a 67 foot wall is completed for AB Parts, and the tap water system for Chikhale and Moho is eight feet short of completion which the MIDC agrees to connect.

Internal: People from Hoechst Co. are hosted for economic modules and House sends staff to cluster villages for actuation and planning meetings. Chikhale and Area team work on Maruti Babhale's passport and visa for the Nairobi GRA.

Contradiction: Dividing and imaging responsibility for the mission so the risks can be won while holding the tension of the external task and the internal life. (Week 6&7)

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Two CYFs are held for 75 students in Deogaon Ashram School and 61 students in Vaitarna High School. Three Adivasi people are sent from cluster village, Chandrachi Meth, to Nasik for driving course. Three day cluster consult has 70 people participating.

Internal: Principal Mr. M. S. Gosavi of Byr College visits Vaviharsh Ashram and talks on NSS Camp. Ashram receives new paint and decor and internal life training begins for new staff.

Contradiction: Completing cluster documentation as soon as possible so that it can be shown to four-sector people. (Week 7)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: With the paperwork now complete, BAIF inspect the site of their second proposed percolation tank in Jawale. Villagers receive an unexpected call from the BDO who later accompanies BAIF's site visit. Rs1,000 from the S.S.S. organization are received to assist the cluster's health programme.

Internal: Cluster newsletters are printed for distribution. The EG at last have two new benches to suit their size and the House sends out Kevin Boivin to Fifth City after working in Jawale for one year and in India for four.

Contradiction: Completing our tasks effectively with time, money and transportation threatening to disrupt the programme. (Week 6)*

PUNE—THE MAALE HOUSE

External: Wadgaon Preschool survey is completed with 91 children whose parents are ready to pay Rs 10 each. Actuation of Maale lift irrigation scheme continues with additional signatures and a joint meeting is held with Mudsinghi. Sewing class opens in Maale.

Internal: Makwana family joins Maale Ashram bringing skills in sewing and embroidery. Development team of A. Paul and A. Algoankar spend week in Kolhapur and Sangli.

Contradiction: [No contradiction submitted] (Weeks 9,10)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: Buldawd engineers submit building estimate and drinking water is repaired. B.A.I.F. advises Budhoda village people about future planning. Shivaji holds birthday fair and Budhoda village people participate. New information about Ambar Charkha industries land arrives as Budhoda builds Ambedkar statue.

Internal: House has celebration with Area Team member Ambaji Kamble.

Contradiction: None submitted (week 5)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: House tiles for demonstration walls in five houses each in Mandurgad and Nandora are donated by The Centre of Science for Villages. Pipes are distributed for drainage in Sevagram and Karenji Kaji. Ambar Charkha programme takes another leap as five more units are supplied to both Piyai and Bhankheda from Gandhi Ashram, who also supplied bales of cotton (raw material). Women's Awakening Institute report is printed and distributed to four sectors. Village Leaders Conference is held in Sevagram with nine villages from two clusters represented. Seventy-five people come to the opening ceremony of this two day programme where the Block Development Officer gives a great, practical keynote talk. This programme decides on twelve common programmes for the block which will focus the participation of (four sectors) action guilds in agriculture, environment and social arenas.

Internal: House shramdam is held to prepare for VLC including new decor, then follows it with great celebration. Kokane and Yeshoda Varma are sent out to Area Meeting in Jawale. Mohan Borker finally gets his full driving license for the jeep. Massive food credit bill of Rs4,000 is finally paid off.

Contradiction: Using the time until troops come back and quarter planning is done to prepare for the coming quarter. (Weeks 11,12)

NAGPUR—THE TEMBHURWAHI HOUSE

External: 750 cluster vilagers witness the opening of the Mahatma Gandhi Statue by the Hon Mrs Yashodhara Bajaj, Maharashtra State Minister for Public Works. Prominent among the VIP guests are Mr Potdukhe MP, Mr Mamulkar MLA and the Collector. Tembhurwahi leadership works around the clock during 36 hour timeline to set up space, collect Rs 183 expenses and deliver 200 invitations. The event is reported on All India radio and in four newspapers. Dr Amin from DRDA checks the bakery trainees and the bakery plot is measured. Sirsi Mahila Mandal lodges application to the District Industries Centre for chili grinding machine.

Internal: NST students Gopal and Sudhakar impact the Ashram with new skills in English and profound witness. WCDS volunteer Fiona is sent out to her new assignment in Faridabad cluster, and the Ashram welcomes home Vinod and the Neware family.

Contradiction: Empowering the CDA leadership so that it becomes a whole-village, participatory dynamic and cluster demonstration. (Weeks 9 & 10)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: Preschool shed is built in Jambron and Medhda holds shramdan and meeting with Gram Sevak. Managing Director of Village Bank in Pradhpur adopts six cluster villages.

Internal: Wood is obtained for Ashram repairs, S. Sawarkhed arrives from Sevagram and Prasad family is sent out on discontinuity. Marathi classes start.

Contradiction: Setting up Global Women's Forums without any educated women on the staff. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Canara Bank representatives visit. The Agricultural Department agrees to do demonstration plots in 5 villages (7). Bata supervisors' course starts. Health survey done in Sarchi and Korijamapur. Sewing class moves into new sewing center. Harijan chopal celebration of its completion. Roteract site visit (5).

Internal: Laxmi arrives, and the Bhoysers leave for their discontinuity. Alan returns from documentation, and then leaves for Council preparation. Bevin Ennis visits (7). Fiona McIntosh and Wendy Lynn return. Fiona Berresford and Madan Tribhuwan go to Chicago Council. Alan Berresford returns from Nairobi and goes to Maliwada for documentation. Dinner and dance at new colleagues house. Ruby Tribhuwan returns in time for birthday celebration. Edi Ward arrives and marks the beginning of her internship with a new intern ritual which journeys the whole house.

Contradiction: How to keep momentum in the midst of assignment shifts, preparation for Council, and general transition into the new year. Seeing how to cover the bases in the midst of monsoon rains, uncooperative jeep, and staff dispersion, as well as moving in courageous leaps. (Weeks 5-7)*

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Health meeting in Gunjurpalya (Eye Camp) involves 8 colleagues from the four sectors and 90 local participants representing four cluster villages. The three most prestigious Chambers of Commerce in Madras city agree to co-sponsor the forthcoming Madras RDS and hand over their cheques. With the completion of the state-wide Andhra Pradesh RDS, the number of RDS grads in Southern India totals 226 from 123 organizations (7). All requirements are completed for free electrification of 50 houses across the cluster for low caste and low income families. Three lawyers from High Court come to Dinay and agree to write up land rights petition for families who have built houses on government land (5).

Internal: House participates in Independence Day celebrations and find it a good time to reflect on covenant, vision, and commitment (7.) Stuart and Samson go to Hyderabad for RDS and Canara Bank consultancy. Ramesh goes to Sevagram for Cluster meeting. The rest of us worry about illegal electric connection of our house, stove repairs, and a district-wide kerosene shortage (for cooking and non-electric lighting) (5).

Contradiction: Prioritizing our response to overwhelming demands and opportunities. Keeping a move on when the practices (stove, electricity, kerosene) seem to take all the time. (Weeks 5-7)*

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: A week of publications work results in the Eastern India RDS document being printed and annual report third draft written with text, photos, and diagrams submitted to professional advertising agency for layout and art work (in-kind). Last ads are collected and also submitted. Representative sent to Women's Information Network meeting is invited to submit article to first newsletter on women's issues.

Internal: A miracle four-day passport manoeuvre allows Anil and Lucina Prasad to leave for Global Academy: Brussels and Pratidan Halder to leave for Global Council. E.C. horizons expand as they watch their first plane take off, and they swim for the first time.

Contradiction: Monitoring complexity of tasks to ensure follow through. (Week 1)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: NSC meets and decides to hold nine symposiums covering the islands of Sumatra, Java, Sulawesi, and Bali, as news interview by NSC member appears in Bandung paper, the location of the first symposium in September..

Internal: House welcomes Kevin Grandy of Boston on his way from Hong Kong to Medan via one week in Jakarta.

Contradiction: Saying yes to the momentum of the NSC and models that do not quite fit ICA models.(Weeks 2&3)

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Tactics for getting the new Governor's audience include a brief four year summary report of ICA, letter from Camat to Bupati for continued ICA presence and request and encouragement for a recommendation letter from Bupati to the governor.

Internal: House celebrates with one big party the arrival of Julia from Nairobi GRA and send out of Rebecca and Romanus to Brussels Academy. The week is capped off with an early July 4th celebration at the American Consulate.

Contradiction: Establishing the image of expanding activities popping the lid off July 7 agreement completion date. (Week 13)

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: A training module proposal is sent to the Socio-Economic Development Unit of the Prime Minister's Department at their request and an informative LENS follow up visit is made to the advisor of Bank Negara as part of the overall strategy to build up a programmatic track record with the public sector (7). 1982-83 Audit Document Report completed and delivered to auditor and we receive \$2,000 contribution from Readymix Concrete (6). Second LENS for this month successfully held with 35 teaching and administrative staff of the Workers' Institute of Technology in Pandamaran. Participants begin with great apprehension and conclude by describing the consensus to move as "a miracle". Participant observers from the Transport Workers Union provide future access for LENS marketing with the Trade Union sector in Malaysia (5). LENS held successfully with Dataprep, a Malaysian computer sales and service company, for 25 of their managers and staff. Follow up session reveals that one of the key tactics of horizontal communication was implemented with a company wide meeting where six non-managerial participants took the company through the LENS charts (4)

Internal: Kevin Grady sojourns with us on his odyssey across the globe and the Gilgrens leave for Medan after their brief discontinuity at the KL house (7). The Gilgrens arrive to spend their discontinuity and the House sends out Ken Fisher to Brussels and begins quarter planning with a series of brooding conversations (6). V. Pathmanathan, recent Academy grad and colleague, has his first experience teaching LENS. Late night conversations with Ken Fisher give the house a welcome opportunity to have a third dynamic as we discuss issues ranging from corporate culture, to sexuality, Order history and intentional style (5). Mary Hoff and Ken Fisher's presence as LENS staff bring interchange to the KL house in a new way. K.P. Choong, our board member, has his first experience in teaching LENS. At the end of LENS, the house takes a trip down to the historic town of Malacca (4).

Contradiction: With the completion of the 1982 audit and the approach of the Annual General Meeting of ICA Malaysia, how do we adequately think through and be prepared to launch the House and the Board into another year, sensitive to the public profile needs. As the time for the next Annual General Board Meeting of the ICA Malaysia draws near, imaging and scheduling it in such a way as to fit with everyone's schedule. (Weeks 4-7)*

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: To celebrate 38 years anniversary of Indonesia on August 17, Bontoa community working together with LKMD and elementary school teachers held many activities: a workday for house beautification competition; a 6-day sports competition among adults and children; skill and intelligence competitions between RTs (stakes); and sports for elementary school children from three different schools. 500 people come to Bontoa for the Independence Day celebration (7). This week has been full with the workday in Bontoa and cluster which completed the security house, worked on the Bontoa mosque renovation, cleaned the streets and did beautification. IGRKK (pre-school cadres) form 5 women's business groups, working together with PENMAS to support pre-school program in each village. Three groups, Bontoa, Panjallingan and Belang-Belang, have been started. The community forms a committee for Independence Day celebration and village sport competition (5). The House participates in workday with 20 Bontoa villagers to clean the graveyard and to build a new security house (Pos Ronda). Bontoa documentation in Indonesian language is completed and sent to Jakarta. A one-day frame visit is made to all

government offices to get permission to stay longer in Kampang Bontoa and give the quarter report. Successful visit to Hasanuddin University regarding the rural development research activities in South Sulawesi is held (4).

Internal: The staffs go to Bantimurung for spring water swimming and to Pangkep for movie, as House celebrates Indonesian Independence Day and the completion of Quarter IV (7). Roundtable with the Bontoa youth leaders and study of Japanese management bring new understanding how to be a successful business. One day we use Indonesian language and the next day, English as a regular English language training mode. (5).

Contradiction: Finishing cluster documentation and starting economic program for Bontoa youth group with limited skill and experience. (Weeks 4-7)*

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: The House experiences the week with potential of private sector support within and beyond. We pick up the first cheque for self-support income from computer word-processor and greet the arrival of a new Xerox machine and new stationary (7). We show the Global Film to 70 Australian women and are currently working on a film on Putsan with the staff of PGI. Pick up cheque for \$6,000 from AMOCO Foundation and 2 new companies give monies. Visit with Beth Barbero from the Philippine National Voluntary Services Coordination (5). Visit to the Japanese Embassy opens new doors of relationship and ADAB representative works on accountability of grant with us (3). House sends out Jess and Jean to Cebu, Bohol, Zamboanga and Davao for visits, research and IERD project documentation, and receives back agricultural technicians from AMSF who have returned from Palawan HDP on a 17-day agricultural demonstration work (2).

Internal: Don Cramer's return marked the week with a great celebration, playing new songs, hearing new stories of animals and reports on Nairobi and Chicago Council (7). House celebrates the commissioning of new priors by going out for an elegant dinner. We finish 2-month budget projection and create development manoeuvres. The Townleys stop in the Manila House for a short visit (5). Roundtable feast at the Jeepney Restaurant of the Intercontinental Hotel precedes preparation for the day of fasting focusing on the future of the Order (3). Bernardito Rosalada from Cebu Region and Elizabeth Caperton from Hong Kong Development Centrum join the Manila House to update development calls. IERD workshop procedures team are hosted in the House. The week ends with a celebration viewing of 'Octopussy' (2).

Contradiction: Building supportive system for unwritten designs. Getting an effective telephone. (Weeks 2-7)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Proposal for year-long training program for Time Inc., Asia, is created and submitted.

Internal: House has party to celebrate Jack's 39th birthday.

Contradiction: Locating the gas to power our IERD Implementation Vehicle. (Week 4)*

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Luncheon invitations are sent to National Advisory Board members and Steering Committee members for first NAB gathering on September 27th, hosted by five Advisory Board members. Quarterly 'UPDATE' is ready for the printer (9). Think Tank on the ICA gives colleagues clearer picture of the ICA and Order and produces four scenarios of how Those Who Care could serve Taiwan in the future. The team updates the IERD Advisory Board list and plans a luncheon to inform members of the Steering Committee's work. Development and self-support checks arrive from China General Plastics and Kodak (8). House team does module on 'Planning Large Meetings' for the Masters' of Business Administration Club, sets the final date for Kodak Problem-Solving Training and begins serious discussions with Ping Tung County government (Hai Ou location) on Supervisors' Training. ROC legislator is added to Steering Committee and the Chairman of the Council of Agricultural Planning and Development agrees to sponsor and speak at RDS (6). Calls to Kaohsiung, visits with AT&T and GE, and mailing eight proposal letters for a total of over NT\$100,000 prepare the usually fallow fields of August and September for a greater yield of program income. Mr. Tsai of the Provincial Department of Agriculture and Forestry joins the IERD Steering Committee. House finally mails think-tank document on the key images affecting ethics and lifestyle in Taiwan today (5).

Internal: House initiates collegium training series on Hosting, Daily Ritual and Journal-News Conversation for new sojourners, Jim and Jennifer Yu, culminating with Jennifer leading Host/Dialogue section of Roundtable with 15 guests and House staff present. Peter Hu completes translation of 4 chapters of Sun Tsu, which are mailed to Chicago (9). Baskin-Robbins comes to town and helps House prepare for ICA Think Tank. Four Taipei Region representatives attend Area Council in the Philippines. Colleague organizes Roundtable enablement as House troops are scattered (8). In the midst of a week of unbelievable schedule adjustments, enthusiasm is created as House check arrives and Roundtable group spontaneously plans its own picnic (6). Jim Yu's wife, Jennifer Pan, joins his sojourn in the House, arriving on the same day as the new water tank, which has to be filled by an emergency delivery of water because of broken city pipelines, and hears the context for the next 16 months in three Global Council reports (5).

Contradiction: Pushing through on our commitments in the face of uncontrollable external global force and the insidious pull of nitty-grittys. Designing the fast-moving training that allows interested colleagues to swing aboard the already fast-moving train. (Weeks 5-9)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: The roof of Poultry Building 1 is under repair following Typhoon Bebing which strikes Tiwi Municipality with 220 kph winds, destroying 50% of the homes in Putsan. Five sacks of rice and 100 dressed chickens are distributed to 156 families who are victims. Poultry Building 2 for layers and broilers, and our new administration building are under construction. Putsan athletic team competes in Tiwi Fiesta Sports Test with 35 joining the 10 km run. Baranguay health worker prepares profile on rural health unit for seminar. Second-hand jeepney is purchased for village. NPC geologies agrees to coordinate watershed project with Tiwi cluster partnership and donates 500 ornamental seedlings for Putsan beautification as school compound is landscaped and road widened (8).

Internal: Baby de Luna from Philippine Geothermal, Inc., in Manila, and Mila Cioson from Tiwi visit Putsan. Elizabeth Caperton arrives from Hong Kong. The staff studies "Man and Development" and adds a women's room to House.

Contradiction: Managing Puroks and Barangoys to create economic venture and renovate buildings during absence of ICA staff for Area Council

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: Island meeting with work day in one of the cluster village "Manlingin". 1,500 pieces of 2"x8"x12" rock delivered to Manila Bagong Dalan and San Miguel free clinic and Sudtonggan pre-school building renovation (7). Free clinic is held in Matumbo with 87 patients. The team receives orders for 6"x8" and 10"x12" rocks and 2,000 10"x12" were completed. We finished planting alugbati leafy vegetable in one plot (5). We receive four boxes of medicine from the Regional Health Office and assorted medicines from Opon Emergency Hospital. Fred Estorgio and company do three days' documentation in Project Compassion in Bohol. Nutrition Fairs are held for the first time in Lapu-Lapu and Cordova and attended by all the pre-schoolers in the Mactan 24 (1).

Internal: Fred Estorgio attends the general orientation of Social Development. Steve Townley visits Sudtonggan, and Philippine Business for Social Progress seminarist also visits Sudtonggan HDP. New House supplies are purchased and House beautification continues (7). Receive vitamins A & D and Triasyn-C from Population Commission (POPCOM). (5) The House celebrates Armstrong's 14th birthday and Lino Pinote's 23rd birthday. (4)

Contradiction: Maintaining the efficiency of our work to deal with the rock workers due to the successive rock orders and dividing our time between different arenas of responsibility. Looking for new strategy in economic ventures. (Weeks 1-7)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

External: MSSD distribute the third batch of rice to drought victims. Monthly baby weighing is completed and reported this quarter. Mr Cesar Gante donates lumber for Langub pre-school building. Highlight of the year is the 5th Anniversary Fair for LHDP and Mountain Cluster Project, attended by the Ministry of Health, POPCOM, MSSD, BPI, MEC and two international staff from Manila and 200 people from the cluster.

Internal: Cluster workers participate in house painting and repair and extending road to the highway.

Contradiction: Beginning the think-tank for next year's work and developing proposals for different agencies to support the program.

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: The Japanese Foreign Ministry decides to send one delegate from their Ministry to the IERD. Toeimachi calls to schedule a second T.M. after the first T.M. solved the community's water problem. Hong Kong Nexus stays after Area Council to set up 21 development calls and write proposals (9). Area Council gathers in Hiuo City for 8 days in which reconfiguration and four year strategy are major themes. All members of Japan Houses, colleagues, Nexus and Seoul representatives give in-put to new decisions. ICA Board of Directors meet to hear reports of Chicago and Area Council, update on Japan IERD, and reflect on reconfiguration. A positive and responsive support for the year(8)

Internal: 1982 Academy Grad Takako Kowamura announces her decision to intern in the Tokyo House. First step of reconfigurations send out Pattersons to Osaka House with a sushi party (9). Celebration of life's journeys with Paul Patterson's 8 birthday and David and Joyce Reese's 32nd anniversary (8).

Contradiction: Drawn out reconfiguration schedule delays Tokyo regional planning and implementation. Moving rapidly but with great strategic care to cover new configuration. (Weeks 9 & 8)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: The second of 7 provinces was visited by NSC members for research on IERD project selection. Two projects were visited. Park Young Soon, who is from that province and is visiting from Houston, joined the team (8). IERD site visits with NSC members to 5 villages in Kyung Gi province tests out the model for site visitation. On returning to Seoul, the teams joined other colleagues including Tang Chee from Hong Kong, in the Seoul House for a Saturday evening barbeque (3).

Internal: New guardian Mr Tang from Hong Kong takes whole House to 5 Star Hotel for dinner(8). The corporate effort of creating new decor was a spiritizing happening for the Seoul House (3).

Contradiction: Gathering the troops who have been and still are returning from the four corners of the globe to plan the next steps. Running a training-oriented program on a project-oriented story. (Weeks 8 & 3)

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: Team visits county office with cluster Saemaul leader and village chief, moving the request for cluster project grain mill one more mile down the road. Team visits Ms Yang, nursing professor, who provides wisdom and direction on how to do programs for women in the city. Cluster village chiefs request serious data on cost to do site visits to Japan, Hong Kong and Taiwan, using one ICA staff as guide(8). House is invited to Cheong Won cluster youth sports day (Baseball game). 150 youth participate from 4 villages and the first prize (a trophy and a wall clock) is given to Ho Jeong 2 Gu Youth team. After games, 4 village chiefs hold a meeting about the strategies of launching the cluster project (7). The team holds a meeting with cluster youth to set up the youth sports day and one with Ri-chiefs to plan cluster project (6). Village day in two of the cluster villages is a great success as leaders are visited, much village clean-up and fixing is done, and the youth of one village ask us to lead them in a town meeting and umpire a baseball game afterwards. House holds workshop on Yeosu to respond to request from companies and Chamber of Commerce to hold a company Saemaul leaders meeting for 17 companies. HDZ workshop plans next steps for village leaders and town meeting (5).

Internal: The team realizes a network has happened in the universities in the city as 6 guests attend Roundtable and another sojourner enters student program and finally decides to create a student sojourn training program guide (8). House has a picnic in Wha Yang Dong Valley with pork barbeque which is cooked on the stones, and welcomes a new sojourner who is a college student, Hong Hae Kyung (7). The team is translating "The Year of the Order Council" on behalf of the whole region (6). Sojourner training continues and Carol and John Han San Schwobel return from the U.S. and Mr Lee returns from discontinuity (5)

Contradiction: Thinking that Regional Council will give final direction for the year. Creating the strategy that will call forth the 'Yes' of service without having to ask directly. (Weeks 5-8)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: English intensive all day on Sunday is a great success with nine participants and three staff. Mr. Ono, a guest at Roundtable who has lived in India one and a half years, owns a clothing factory in India Y.E.S. House completes Regional newsletter. Mr. Yano joins ICA after introduction through English Intensive flyer. Professor Ichimura, who teaches Economics at Kyushu University, is guest at Roundtable and speaks about his two month research at U. of Michigan this spring.

Internal: Naomi Sato celebrates ninth birthday with many friends at party. David Reese is sent out for summer in USA at staff breakfast at New Utani. "Economic Miracle" takes place as all classes covered by three remaining troops.

Contradiction: Involving Regional team in financial plans for ICA. (Weeks 13 & 1)

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: The House returns from Area Council, picking up where we left off, getting ready for September Town Meeting, when the office gets a call from Suita City requesting a Women's Town Meeting following a talk given there by John Lindstrom (9). Looking to the coming year, the House with advisor prepares recommendations for the Area Council using screen of the Panchayat report and the Qtr II regional vision. Planning for two September Town Meetings moves forward. (5)

Internal: Area Council is great event as members affirm the new directions needed in the next four years for Japan, by reconfiguring Houses and phasing this activity over next 7 months, and the House experiences Wayside Inn dynamic as 13 guests come and go (9). House and Regional colleagues participate in the wedding celebration of Rebecca Boon and Yo Yokoyama - a very fine event with the reception program, Cabaret style, enabled by ICA trained people (5).

Contradiction: Figuring out the best caring structures in the midst of overwhelming ambiguity and future changes. (Weeks 5-9)*

THE SAPPORO HOUSE

External: Colleagues from across the region gather for a weekend camp in Oyubari. Families, kids and old friends drop in for workshops, a barbrque party and mountain climbing.

Internal: Visiting relatives engage full time in cooking, cleaning, teaching and camping.

Contradiction: Keeping our vision while in the battle of starting the '83-'84 year. (Week 4)*

AREA SYDNEY

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: Responses to IERD project identification mailing are coming in with great projects and referrals to other groups and projects. The ICA newsletter "Have a Go Gazette" goes into the mail as well as a five page letter regarding Area council. Good call on Dunlop Foot wear yields a working LENS.

Internal: Great reports on Global Council 83 from Margaret Stover spin us into what a great year this has been. Collegium on our HDZ and IERD strategies and resettlement plans hold the tension of theoretical and practical. Council inkind off to good start with wine and paper promised.

Contradiction: Affirming the creative tension between Global, Continental and Regional demands and local possibility. (Week 5)*

SYDNEY-THE MURRIN BRIDGE HOUSE

External: Rural Development Symposia in Dubbo and Leeton with Department of Agriculture build relationship with a new network and open programme possibilities. Mother's Group in Murrin Bridge hosts a bush picnic as a school ourriculum event.

Internal: George Howard and the Oakleys visit, enabling dialogue over a range of missional directions.

Contradiction: Anticipating community directions and national trends in order to effectivly play a guide role in an accelerating drama of events. (Week 3)*

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Representatives from Sydney and Murrin Bridge Houses join us for IERD check signals meeting and plan trek to Alice Springs, N.S.A. meeting and National Laungh Gola event. Ten signal communities have returned data forms for IERD participation.

Internal: Eight E. G. and the Newkirk family go camping in the mountains during V.J.L., highlights being Scavenger Hunt and ice cream feast. Barry and Margaret celebrate completed life of mother Nita Claire Oakley age 93 yrs. She was a pioneer, active in the three great waves of history.

Contradiction: Figuring out what we can do for council rather than what the council can do for us. (Week 6)*

AREA SUVA

APIA - THE NUKU'ALOFA HOUSE

External: Rural Development Symposium (Workshop) preparation moves toward the event. Village surveys are completed in three of five island groups. Workshop leader training in Tongan begins with 12 ready for next session. House and colleagues build corporate talk on Child Development for presentation at national preschool training event. Colleagues work until 4:00 a.m. to translate it before leaving for conference. Vava'u team reports 16 attending the RDS and two Economic Guild meetings as part of Phase II Development Plan for Vava'u. Mike Chapman joins Vava'u Circuit team back on the road again to do Phase II, Economic development and Health caretakers. Rural Development Symposium meeting creates title "The First National Rural Community Development Workshop: United Effort of Cooperative Action". Kindy Rally finds ICA among honored guests for its role in setting up preschools in Tonga. Fetice enlivens small project management seminar with problem-solving workshop. Chief sponsor of Haapa Pacific Training school (Jan 84) phones with 104 names of potential participants. Imaginal Ed course grounds regional team in profound function of our methods. Media coverage makes IERD common knowledge across the nation as Fetu'u and Muli do radio interview and RDS makes front page of the national newspaper. Village surveys in Tongatapu and Vava'u uncover comprehensive development projects and recruit participants for the RDS. Meeting space mix-up lands ESC session in the house and occasions an impromptu workshop on finishing space renovation and public image. First two scholarships arrive as result of mail development manoeuvre. Village surveys in Jangatapu reveal cluster projects sponsored by Roman Catholic orders. The house postpones fast day only to have it fall on the same day that house travels to Kanokupolu to celebrate the completed life of Lilipeti Taukei'aho the two year old daughter our sojourner family. House sends out six monouth volunteer, Henry Bewley, to the U.K. and welcomes Mike Chapman, bearing gifts for two month sojourn. Contradiction: Getting enough distance on RDS in order to get quarter plan launched. Finding ways to release regional team from regular commitments to focus on the RDS and PTS training. (Weeks 4-9)

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

External: Project selection meeting in Visalia chooses nine projects which cover the state and all arenas of Rural Development. Sir Richard Attenborough (Gandhi film) agrees to pursue IERD documenting and GAB membership. Francis Roper is sent to Project Selection Meeting in Chicago with 10 projects selected in the SF/LA bi-region. LA computer guild meeting produces volunteers for project entry onto our computer of LA/SF project surveys and first successful communication takes place between LA Kaypro II and Control Data Corporation main frame in Minneapolis.

Internal: E.G. finally arrive at camp and 4th of July steak cook-out caps weekend of many visitors from Indonesia, Australia and San Francisco. "Return of the Jedi" stars Alice Wright (home from Edmonton), Milind Chitnavis (from taking E.G. to camp), Robert Ennis (from Jamaica) and Jeff Roper (from Nairobi and into hospital with malaria).

Contradiction: Capturing the key victories toward next year's base of program and self-support during July and August. (Week 1)

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: Seattle joins team at World Council of Churches Assembly in Vancouver where 54 guests at two luncheons hosted by Bishop James Mathews and Bishop Havea are impacted by Bishop Mathews's report of the Institute's work and the ICA/IERD videotape introduced and concluded by Ben Kingsley. After 11 weeks of Roundtable, guest panelists on "What's Working" pull together 18 key learnings and plan next series to feature projects which exemplify these learnings. First Area San Francisco site visit to verify data from recommended projects takes place at Columbia Basin Health Association and includes showing of the new video tape which impacts all involved.

Internal: House returns from Area Council and discontinuity to a week of guests and visitor including Bruce Robertson, Butchers, Wordens, Ruth Rawson, Joyce Reese, Lyn Hess and arrival of Carol Butcher for U. of WA. studies.

Contradiction: Making major decisions about facility needs in midst of compressed timelines, ambiguous data and scheduled priority events. (Week 7)*

THE PHOENIX HOUSE

External: Regional Advisory Board is initiated with 8 members. Job hunting opens possibilities for the Effective Supervisor's Course. Office organizing enables a new year and new team. Regional Team participates in collegiums about Global and Area councils

Internal: Elena Harper arrives while Nathan Oyler is sent out to the Student House. Corporate moving task is first self-support venture. The Stovalls arrive, McAdam returns, Randolphs depart, Oylers discontinue, and Schaeffers visit. Sojourner Nancy Carrol gets a new car, and 4 people hunt employment.

Contradiction: Firming up regional events and self support possibilities as stakes for the year by Continental Council. Redesigning House structures to give us more flexibility for accelerating the year. (Weeks 4-7)*

THE DENVER HOUSE

External: Week launched with reduced Day I folks (2) with 500 piece newsletter mailed, new regional brochure taken to printer, LENS scheduled with YWCA for October. Arrangement with Mobil okayed, and Evening at Institute held with 4 potential volunteers. "Sweet Monotony" is relished during discontinuity after two whirlwind months including NSC project selection, IERD funding event, three Rural Development Forums, an urban town meeting, a neighborhood LENS and a two week summer program of four events with an income of \$2500 and an Area Council.

Internal: Denver hosts representatives from three regions, Atlanta, Rochester and Kansas City, who exchange information on showcase forums. A day in the mountains with Area and Regional colleagues celebrates the end of a fabulous year and the launching of another great one.

Contradiction: Beating back the temptation to reduce the mission with reduced numbers of people. (Weeks 6&7)*

AREA EDMONTON

THE EDMONTON HOUSE

External: House moves out in three and sometimes four documentation teams to make documentation visits to 19 projects in all four Western Provinces, at the same time setting up Annual Appeal events and Regional Steering Committee meetings.

Internal: Staple's entertain Bill's parents in Edmonton House in the midst of discontinuity, documentation and self-support

Contradiction: Getting an all Area picture of Annual Appeal events to allow for advance set-up time. (Weeks 7&8)*

THE ANCHORAGE HOUSE

External: Luke Titus, of Minto, says yes to being included on the Alaska Advisory Committee. Will Mayo attends the National Steering Committee meeting in Chicago as Alaska's representative. Over 100 invitations to Alaska Advisory IERD Committee meeting are sent.

Internal: Alan Stocking arrives for the summer and he takes on a phone answering job for the Daily News. Warren Crain, guardian from Seattle, stops by.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum when region is in summer mode. (Week 1)

THE VANCOUVER HOUSE AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: Regional Team experiences the power of corporately searching for "our" training center, especially when the "perfect" possibility is uncovered. Visit to Prairie View A&M stimulates interest in participatory methods within the college. Metro meeting refreshes with dialogue on responsibility for broadening contexts.

Internal: Collegium on Kenya replication sparks reflections on life demand in North American front. House celebrates with laser light concert and ice cream sundaes.

Contradiction: Keeping the continuity of mission going in the midst of shifting personnel. (Week 2)

THE DALLAS HOUSE

External: First of four sessions is prepared in response to request from Texas Instruments for us to do training using their content and our method. United Methodist reporter hires Bill Bailey as permanent manager of promotion. Visits continue with colleagues of the spirit movement in North Texas.

Internal: "Say Amen, Somebody" reminds us of the unique power of music to ground the word about life.

Contradiction: Finding out our expectations are already over. (Week 11)

THE MEMPHIS HOUSE

External: The team secures contact persons for Appalachia Symposium in Tennessee and begins the swirl in Mississippi. Remaining adult, e.g. and youth team get IERD mailing to 120 and Memphis Region NEWS written, laid out, printed and delivered to Post Office. Mississippi Rural Development Symposium task forces for publicity and budget report enthusiasm and models for upcoming November RDS. NSC member, Letty Lynn Maloney, makes presentation at IERD funding event hosted by Gordons in Little Rock, Arkansas for 14 people. Memphis forces submit Mississippi RDS Planning Conference report to *Highlights* editor. ICA works with Ruth Wilson and Bill Linder to set up, facilitate and document 50 person planning conference for Mississippi.

Internal: Bruce Robertson arrives from Seattle doing 25000 miles in four and a half days and Mary Z. Longstreth returns from discontinuity. House receives Nancy Griffin back from Phase I coordination and family discontinuity, enrolls Mariko successfully in day care program and sends out Mollie and Jesse Clements to new assignments in Chicago.

Contradiction: Being "Goldilocks" without getting chased out of the House when the "Bears" come home! (Weeks 4-7)*

THE ATLANTA HOUSE

External: Week revolves around Scott-Little wedding events and vows are repeated in outdoor setting with 50 guests, family and colleagues from all over U.S. present to celebrate Mary and Vincente's decision to be a missional family. Joy Jinks and Bill Bingham visit key North Carolina project, the N.C. Baptist Convention Health and Social Services Training Program, and see the initiation of training for one county as well as the results of health training in another county. Planning workshop facilitated for Knoxville Tn. Teachers Association. Lingo visits with Young's. Wedding preparation intensified with model building, work on grounds and much sewing in the night. In the midst of staggered discontinuity, Alfrieda Wilkins completes R & R in "Order Retreat House" (her words), and Thomases (Joe and Joy) are in, out, in, out, while they coordinate family move. Rose takes a job with Executive Travel and is sent out to Denner for a week of training in computer accounting programme.

Internal: Lynnette Pennington briefs the house on the Priors' Council in preparation for our participation in Continental Council. Vincente arrives in midst of wedding prep work day and Dean Johnson arrives with van of furniture for their room in the House. Massive printing and mailing of regional newsletter, NSC newsletter, and "Success Southern Style" report. We visit Gibson with Powells as they are honoured at luncheon with 50 residents in Fire House restaurant.

Contradiction: Seeing the loose ends as part of our common task. Filling in all the practical gaps, ie (holes in lawn, no paper for IERD printing) so that the bride and newsletter don't fall on their faces. Feeling the burden of wedding and fall programme on our shoulders without systems and roles clarified or expanding our imagination to total troop possibility. (Week 8,4-7)*

AREA CHICAGO

THE CHICAGO HOUSE

External: Continental Council begins to illuminate the three Global Priorities and allow us to celebrate the formation of the Bill and Lynn Edwards family. Lela Mosley returns from the Brussels Academy and Lily Fox goes to East Waterloo, Iowa to talk about the Fifth City Model to interested community people.

Internal: The House sends Sharon Heiges out to her new assignment in Madrid

Contradiction: Integrating the implications of the Year of Order Council with our local mission. (Week 10)*

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE External: Westport teachers hold appreciation breakfast for 300 teachers and IERD steering committee meets. Week focused on Westport Cluster includes prep for teachers' appreciation breakfast, orientation session for School Advisory Council and the discovery that the Cluster is actually 10 schools, not nine.

Internal: The K.C. house is most interestingly active this week as four people are sent out to the Council, Sheahan Paul and Mark Rebstock arrive to see school open, and Brian Hawley celebrates his 15th birthday. Beginning of the new year symbolized by Lori acquiring a new job at law library, Brian, Stuart and Jerome arriving and moving into rooms, and Juliet beginning Community College.

Contradiction: Beginning and maintaining the balance between external mission, internal life, study and self support. (Weeks 8-10)*

LORIMOR HDP

External: Special committee of Southern Iowa Council of Governments requests LENS proposal with focus directed to future role of SICOG to local communities. East Waterloo LENS demonstrates blacks and whites working shoulder to shoulder with facilitation team representing Lorimor, Fifth City, Detroit, Minneapolis and Kenya. Lorimor Community Development Corporation decides to hire lawyer to move more quickly on reorganization of sewing industry with Iowa Development Commission and small business cooperation. House sends off IERD mailing while proposals to the Iowa Development Commission and the Institute of Public Affairs combined with a circuit to Waterloo reveal how a state demonstration could be done. The Southern Iowa Council of Government designates a committee to design a strategy for cooperative action in Midcrest. Call on Jack Bailey, new Director of Iowa Development Commission, produces request for proposal to help build a six-year economic plan for Iowa by December. Presentation to Southern Iowa Council of Governments executive board produces a committee assigned to work through recommendations as to how SICOG might work with ICA in Midcrest. Contradiction: Creating eventfulness of metro visits which will enable colleagues to decide their movemental engagement in the year 1983-84. Deciding what it really means to be the Year of Order Council with the press of all sorts of opportunity calling. (Weeks 4-8)*

THE MINNEAPOLIS HOUSE

THE DETROIT HOUSE

THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: Visit to RDS project wins big YES to hosting five-county Showcase Forum with visions of launching a replication zone. Mid-North Indianapolis Partnership hold fourth 90-day Celebration and Planning event at Butler University with major emphasis on building and broadcasting the story of this urban HDZ. Participation in Hiroshima Day vigil lays groundwork for "Inter-Movement Think Tank". Private companies and public agencies volunteer technical services, printing, and professional practicum training for the new Mid-North Home Holps, Inc., now in its fourth week of preparing "welfare" mothers for employment in human service ventures. Kingsley/IERD video premiered in Indiana at the Debra Drown send-out to her new India assignment, in Kentucky at the Appalachia RDS Steering Committee session, and in Ohio at the Cincinnati Metro Council. Department of Local Government, State of Kentucky, contracted with ICA to facilitate a one day program where mayors and county judges met to design their own training program. Warren, Indiana (RDS community) agrees to host 10 county symposium.

Internal: Fifty guests crowd into the Gary and Pat Drown home to send out Debra to new India assignment. House attends State Fair and local cabaret. House launches new edge in symbolic life with adapted "YES" ritual for even weeks and a set of Daily Readings for odd weeks. New House decor rationale and new internal life design mark shift in consciousness to Year of Order Council.

Contradiction: Gathering momentum for a new leap across the region and figuring out where we are going to land. (Weeks 5-7)*

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: A \$10,000 donation is given to ICA development through Roman Haas in Philadelphia. In the private sector a new contact was made with Mr. Nanaka of Japan who could be a foothold into the private sector of the U.S. In Maine 167 are now registered for the Rural Development Sumposium.

Internal: The Metafile Software package arrives which allows the Paradigm business in the House to pick up data entry work which has been on hold for six months.

Contradiction: Building the Metabilt while running from event to event. (Week 10)

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: Meeting with United Way director and RPI Community Relations Director opens door for Troy Community Coordinating Council \$3700 of pledges in hand before Annual Appeal begins.

Internal: Gala House Church with 23 around the table celebrates Howie's 25th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Pulling many program threads through Annual Appeal to give one regional thrust. (Week 10)*

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: Local IERD team pursues new possibilities for host of October IERD benefit. Work continues on facility and models for arrival of nine Lutheran seminarians who will live with House from September through December.

Internal: House celebrates discontinuity while continuing to host steady stream of global guests. Sandra and Lynn True join Robert in their new assignment and Doris Rettig also arrives.

Contradiction: Getting clear on our total situation so we can discern the new being called for from us this year. (Week 5-7)*

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: After an article in the May issue of *Independent Schools* magazine describing the ICA's work with student leadership training at Northfield Mt. Hermon School, inquiries come in from a dozen schools across the country. Training, Inc. funding work hits a new high as the last major proposal is submitted and two offers of downtown, re-habbed, low-rental space are received.

Internal: Thirteen visitors on Wk. II double the size of the House overnight and keep the Wayside Inn bustling. A report on the summer council and Wk. II writing of 82-83 program report for New England provide excellent occasions for in-depth collegiums

Contradiction: Being thoroughly prepared now for 1983-84 and the Continental Council while remaining open to new gestalts and operational designs. (Week 6)*

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: With the help of sojourners David Grodosdy and Mike Arnoni, the House aids Starks Enterprises to put in first layer of furnace ceiling, to mount and frame the spray room fan, to publish the August-September Starks *VOICE* and to conduct a successful Starks Library tea on the patio of the PEEPS.

Internal: House celebrates life through Starks slide show for sojourners, State Fair, Madison Anson Festival, "Comedy of Errors", "Godspell", and Machaias blueberry festival.

Contradiction: Turning momentum and possibilities into tenant on site. (Week 7)*

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: Eight regional colleagues participate in visiting 15 projects to do documentation for IERD. Three co-sponsors, regional colleagues and development prospects are powerfully impacted in a series of showings of the 18-minute video tape of June RDS.

Internal: Ted Farrar leads the house in a three-hour report on the July 83 Council "Toward Forging the New Shape of the Religious." House is impacted by the comprehensive set of activities proposed for the 16 months of the Year of Order Council, especially the December 1984 pilgrimage to embody social repentance.

Contradiction: Finding the appropriate way to tell the story of the projects we are documenting. (Week 5)*

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: Two towers at Habitation Jeanne Mance take July 1st (Canada Day) outside for a grand fe^{te}. Staff travels to Western Canada to participate in National Steering Committee Meeting and the Stony Plaine, Alberta Exchange Conference.

Internal: Annual Interprovincial bicycle race passes our door doing 50 laps while we host 6th grade trip and Montreal grand churches allow for youth to meditate on Ground of Being.

Contradiction: Learning how to work with people from all sectors to allow for reflection on missional focus and individualize programmes. (Week 12)

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Meeting with RDS sub-committee reveals that the NSC has decided to take on the full task of directing the work of the RDS. 26 people are registered for full participation in the RDS, Sept. 1-3. Visit from Ernesto Olascuaga pushes on local participation and the need for the local approach to be heard, especially in view of Mexico's long history of projects. UNDP head suggests strategy of having government involved in Lady Peggy's visit in October.(8) Mexico's RDS is held in state of Hidalgo with 8 presentations encompassing a diversity of views, cultures, and strategies. Over against the historical and intentional underdevelopment of the 85% in Mexico (the campesino population) one participant remarked, "It's the first time that the government talked about its problems and how to resolve them." We continue to reap victories of the Time/Life LENS as Gillette expresses strong interest in LENS for their management team.(10)

Internal: Alerdings arrive and Linda returns from Guatemala and the work of transition includes some fine restaurants.(8) Epley family returns from discontinuity, Jack Gilles is sent out to N. A. Continental Council and House engages in movie conversation on Flannery O'Connell movie "Wise Blood".(10)

Contradiction: Implanting images that the IERD is for local people while shifting the task of the NSC from the momentum of the RDS to fund-raising so that our attention can turn to cluster strategy. (Weeks 8&10)

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: The cooperative buys the first goods for the store which include fertilizer, pesticides, and other agricultural products with a value of \$600.00 and visits a similar agricultural cooperative which is 2 years old, learning that it has many advantages it was not aware of before. Local teacher decides that she will go to neighboring village to start a preschool for only partial pay. Linda Vernoooy and Jaime Hernandez arrive with Apple II computer and begin to create program plans for the cooperative, loan accountability and ICA programs.

Internal: Inga is sent out to Venezuela to celebrate the completed life of her mother and Linda, Jaime, and Robert Blumberg of Washington arrive to work on set-up of the new computer.

Contradiction: Inventing new images for local promoter roles (Week 4)

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External: Following HDTI graduation of 60 village leaders, implementation treks are held in Portland and St. Andrew in 10 villages with 28 meetings creating 2 year tactical timelines. Blue Mountain Yallah's Valley Cluster treks are begun with Rotary volunteers. IDB and NCB make 3 site visits to Woburn Lawn with full page ad in Gleaner on Woburn Lawn loan programme. Mary and Alice are welcomed back from Nairobi GRA. Presentation is made to 5 Methodist Churches. Lecture given to Cornell University graduate students at UWI. Princeton student and Peace Corps volunteers visit Woburn Lawn.(12-6) The Woburn Lawn Economix Development Cooperative Society Ltd. holds its Annual General Meeting and 3rd anniversary with officials from IDB, NCB and Co-op Dept. giving their praises. Alice Wright is re-elected as Chairman. Rotary International volunteer, Paul Crouch, who is Chairman of the Brother's Brother Foundation and former Managing Director of ALCOA in Jamaica, presents tools and books to the H.E.A.R.T. Trust and Library Service who present them to the Woburn Lawn Project through the Kingston Rotary Club. Pre Co-op meetings are held in the Blue Mtn. Cluster and 2 year tactical timelines are built in Yallah's Valley Cluster.(7)

Internal: House sends out Denison Pierre to Dominica and welcomes Rob and Nadine from the Global Council and Benjamin from the 6th grade rite of passage. House welcomes Bill and Dan Bingham on visit, holds celebration sending out a Dutch and an English volunteer and has first total House meeting in six weeks.

Contradiction: Filling full the practical implications of a replication strategy which pushes in new directions into unknown territory and sustaining, expanding and deepening the movement.(Weeks 12-7)

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: The ICA held a week-long training program for local health caretakers in the Sierra Mountains in the next province with special presentations every evening on health topics with filmstrips to over 150 residents. One of the highlights for the staff was the 5 hour ride home in the back of a truck crowded in with 40 other people, 5 goats and 2 pigs. The team also held Roundtables showing the Globla film to 350 people in 5 communities and set up workdays as follow-up events in each community.(3) A detailed tactical plan was created for developing \$50,000 this year. Cluster meeting creates a new calendar of events for each community and new task team assignments to launch the new year with new direction and high motivation.(9)

Internal: House plants second demonstration House garden and installs electricity in the new dorm rooms. A week of planning for the quarter sets new style for the Year of Order Council with new time and space designs. Interns have new roles of major responsibility for the whole task and the arrival of Mike Arnoni, new bilingual volunteer from Canada, adds another new dynamic to the House.

Contradiction: Completing the new dormitory space fast enough to accomodate waiting interns without a clear funding image for the completion. (Weeks 3-9)

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: Visit to the Instituto Agrario Nacional in Guatire reveals the readiness of a public/private/voluntary coalition to initiate an agricultural and trades training centre in Barlovento. Meeting of the IERD technical committee reports progress made in contacting various Venezuelan development organizations. "Solvencia" request is completed and delivered to Dividendo (private enterprise foundation) to open door for future private sector funding.(3) The House launches full steam into the "new year" by aiding in 2 Chapel painting workdays, recruiting 10 people from 5 villages for our next school, making assignments, a budget, menus, adjusting the curriculum and participating in a Cluster sports interchange between the villages of Cano Negro and La Boca.

Internal: Marriage of regional colleagues Maria Rosa and Daniel Lahoud offers opportunity for Lutheran-Catholic dialogue. The House prepares for the "new year" by cleaning out the offices, the garden and the front lawn, setting up 3 dorms, and creating new internal life models.

Contradiction: Unblocking decisions on Development proposals for the coming year in the midst of a national malaise and "wait and see" attitude because of currency devaluation.(Weeks 3-8)

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: A good possibility for money and training for women in the Sol bakery comes from a colleague who works with local people in villages. A meeting with 11 presidents of Directivas in the county of Lampa sets up two forums and two meetings for more information. First training session of ICA's methods for new and old colleagues and a great visit with Ipru in Uruguay gives the team new possibilities for interchange and training events. After many months our first Town Meeting is confirmed. The second session of training methods continues to draw new colleagues to participate. The last community forum training session was held at the House, honing the skills necessary for the key Saturday forum in Batuco, the 2nd largest community in the county, which was a great success and the team is ready for anything.

Internal: Darlene's birthday is celebrated many times as many House members are sent out to discontinuity. As House members return, internal plans turn toward a new house.

Contradiction: Using the stillness in the center of the storm to reorganize the team and task for full speed ahead. (Weeks 4-8)

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: In three weeks development brings in about \$1900 including \$280 raised in Rio Bonito for purchase of a 16mm film projector. Community Centre Inauguration in Bracana (after 8 months of construction) is highlighted by speeches by several residents, ribbon cutting by the prefect and the sale of new community T-shirts. NSC meets to set-up sub-committees for fund-raising, project selection and publicity. Farmers in Bracana and Tatus hold the first meeting of the Bracana/Tatus Farmer's Association and elect officers. The team visited the new mayor in Rio Bonito who asks for a closer relationship in the future. Project selection committee studies and categorizes 20 IERD project summaries and decides to send form 2 to 12. The Bracana and Mata community clusters formalize their consensus of the year's directions by moving ahead on implementation. Rio Bonito office continues building linkages between ICA and municipal structures. The first community interchange takes place when four men from the Mata community have lunch at the House before spending an afternoon in Bracana visiting houses, chatting with producers and principally looking around the community centre. Money raised on the ICA stall at the inauguration was used this week to fit glass in all the centre's windows. IERD keeps on schedule with forms 1&2 translated and ready to post to eleven possible projects, plus progress reports sent to UNDP and UNICEF.

Internal: House uses Roundtable to study the 82-83 Kenya report.

Contradiction: Involving the existing structures without destroying community momentum. (Weeks 4-9)

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: Ministry of Development and Cooperation is interested in a proposal for IERD funding. Friends of ICA, ASBI set up relative to legalizing Service Ventures. Service Ventures sends out substantial Hostelry and Computer Service mailings. Letter from WHO director general establishing working relationship to ICA, visit to NORAD in Oslo to correct an evaluator report, participation of colleagues and neighbors in the Cabaret with electrician deciding to attend Academy and volunteer for the Ivory Coast, while doing 8 Service Ventures contracts, ground the image of the resourceful remnant.

Internal: All guests and House are impacted by the premier showing of the Indonesian film.

Contradiction: Getting perspective which enables discernment of which decisions are immediate and which need to wait until Continental Council with the knowledge that all decisions are 'eternal'. (Weeks 4-5)*

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: A Rural Development Symposium in Bangalore sponsored by the Canara Bank brings together 17 volunteer agencies and seven banks.

Internal: Seven people from the Nexus join 3000 in celebrating the marriage of Asaram Rokhade and Mangla More in Athwad, a former district project village. A blue sari, a journal and centerpiece gifts are given to symbolize their decision to be in the ICA. Nexus Order Day and fasting day with key reflection create a week of celebration of life.

Contradiction: Complexity in orchestrating year end demands tends to blur images of riding momentum. (Weeks 9)

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: Participation in Area Councils within the continent is preceded by extended collegiums on Priorities, Memorials, Nexus Experiment and Finances. We celebrated with Area Suva their receipt of the first scholarship for the next Pacific Training School. IERD visits continue in Hong Kong with presentations to Raj Yoga group and social services network which will culminate in a symposium next month. Linda is sent out to her assignment on New Delhi, having raised \$1125 towards her travel.

Internal: The image of creative dancing House sees in 'Flashdance' is very appropriate as Nexus enters this new year of experiment and the Telfords are sent out to their new assignment. Visitors come and stay for a meal: Daljit Singh from Tata Company, India spins us the exciting story of his company's social development and thrills the youth when he reveals himself to be an International Cricketer.

Contradiction: Ensuring the appropriate containers for the vintage wine of this year of Nexus experiment. (Weeks 7-9)*

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: Meeting with Control Data Corporation in Minneapolis produces structure of data base for the IERD document. Donation of \$10,000 toward Order Council is received from colleague on top of \$50,000 Annual Appeal pledge symbolizing forthcoming support for the Year of Order Council.

Internal: First in a series of 44 house study constructs symbolizes seriousness relative to the Year of Order Council as we begin our new bi-weekly time design alternating task force work with study and research.

Contradiction: Massive vision of the Year of Order Council, particularly for the next quarter, is not captured in visible structures nor practical implementaries. (Week 12)*

The key contradiction lies in the arena of having June/July global assignments drain the momentum established towards July 31st. (Week 9)

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that a four hour debriefing session with Mary and Sethe, two colleagues from England, provides refreshing break from hectic Nairobi GRA prep. Volunteer research on how to get a foothold into the education structures provides data and new strategies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of discerning what method will document the journey of Nava Gram Prayas so the world can see the victory and wisdom. (Week 9)

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that for the IERD taskforce - this was the week to deepen the involvement of the Indian Steering Committee in the preparation phase of the IERD. In Bangalore RDS, Mr. B. Rudramoorthy participates actively not only in the process of the event but representing the IERD to the people gathered as well as to the whole public answering burning questions. In the same week Mr. Bhoopat Trivedi asks to be on the ISC but really offers to hold an RDS in Jamnagar for more local level in Gujrat. The breakthrough is experienced in the arena of RDS set up for which there are materials, guidelines and methods created and sent out to the Houses. The futuric contradiction for the IERD taskforce for the coming week 10 is limited utilisation of resources available to ensure the comprehensiveness of the IERD. (Week 9)

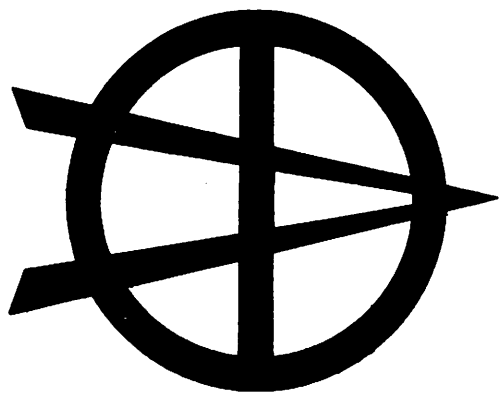
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: House participates in innovative transportation model to conquer Belgian train strike and rush hour traffic in Paris, conveying new house to Madrid from Continental Council. "Miracle lady" who kept up operational skeleton over the summer breathes sighs of relief and shudders of fear and fascination as new House arrives.

Internal: First House Church of the year is celebrated with all four families present--Soderland, Armas, Heiges, and Ferguson. (Where are you Judy Boyd?)

Contradiction: Discerning planning scheduled for Week II of Week 12. (Week 11)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Training Center construction shifts into fourth year as village carpenters raise the roof, install window frames and start the inside walls, utilizing the expertise of the Portuguese Youth Program to build the bathroom and cement the rocks in the outside walls. A work day in Bigorne with the OTL paints street numbers on all of the houses for the post office. The Volvo is sold the same day the Toyota loses its clutch, leaving the House carless(8). Germans arrive for a month's work camp and adds strength to village beautification and Training Center construction in Mezio. Landlord returns for vacation, arranges House contract for following year and gives roofless, doorless, windowless building for Training Center grand possibility. Portuguese Youth Training program brings preschools and youth programs to nine Montemero mountain villages twice a week. First mural in Mezio is completed on work day combining all forces present(4).

Internal: Paul's architect brother, Pieter, and colleague, Truus, arrive from Holland and Lee Ferguson from London en route to new assignment to add expertise and brute force to Training Center construction (8). Paul returns from Chicago as Ana Maria leaves for a month at Fatima. Two Dutch volunteers, Hugo and Oscar, from last year drop by, adding strength to work force at the right moment (4).

Contradiction: Having Training Center habitable and House moved in within one week while depending on voluntary labor to get the job done. Weaving multitude of languages, cultures, ages and lifestyles into one mighty force to catalyze program actuation. (Weeks 4-8)

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: Three P.D.L.'s organized and visited by the National Steering Committee. Development letters and proposals are sent to trusts and banks.

Internal: Five volunteers just returned from Bangalor, Jamaica, Tokyo, Kenya and Zambia come by and report for a few days. Twenty-one people attend a two and a half day Volunteer Orientation Week End with 15 saying "yes". Claire is sent on Panchayat trek and Chrisina and Matthew Clark arrive for the year.

Contradiction: Unidentified, time for internal tasks leaves big gaps in co-ordination of House life. (Weeks 11,12)*

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Mr Stephane Hessel, formerly of Ministry of Cooperation and now concerned with audio-visual communication, in France, agrees to be on Global Advisory Board.

Internal: A good look at the Communications Manual which we received in June opens our eyes to possibilities. Reading Samuel Pizar's 'The Human Resource' helps us understand USSR-Europe-USA relations, points to commerce as key to detente, explodes an image of possibility by describing the riches of the continent of Antarctica (look at Peters' projection realizing that Antarctica does by treaty belong to all the nations!), and insists that humanity's first priority is development of the human resource. Pizar is Polish-born, American citizen, international lawyer, living in Paris, closely associated with J-J Servan-Schreiber.

Contradiction: Designing new office space to communicate effectiveness and relevance to ourselves and all comers. (Week 7)

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

External: Men's group quarter-end evaluation suggests vastly expanded group for next year. IERD inquiries come in.

Internal: Visits with Dick West, Frank & Aimee Hilliard, Don Bushman, Tim Lush and Barbara Barkony continue conversations on the future.

Contradiction: Responding creatively to non-renewable visas. (Week 2)

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: House welcomes Academy grads as they move out from Brussels to see some of Europe and share the story of their eight weeks. Amsterdam Region circuit to attend IERD Steering Committee meeting and regional team meeting starts dialogue over form of ICA when Order is no longer resident in Amsterdam. Project visitation circuit involves House and members of NSC in northern Frankfurt Region.(9) The globe came to the House as it hosted Kang Byang Hoon from Korea and one of Sapporo's English students, Mr. Itagaiki. IERD funding proposals took up the lion's share of the House's time.(6)

Internal: Unexpected plans of the city to use a part of the backyard force us to harvest some of our green tomatoes and pumpkins and to make relish and jelly and celebrate the abundance of the garden.(9) The training dynamic became real in the form of one more person to the Academy for a module of training, and Jorg Mayer completing his second week of sojourning in the House.(6)

Contradiction: Creating a way to focus our corporate mind on the coming year in the midst of diffused individual tasks. Allowing the story that 'We can't plan until after the Academy' to block significant action relative to self-support. (Weeks 6-9)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: Lady Peggy Lindsay's visit expands the IERD/NSC frame and context with 11 calls in two days covering all sectors. Last minute Academy enlistment calling elicits four participants.

Internal: Week is highlighted by celebrations as House participates in colleague's birthday party in Amsterdam and board chairman, Jan Joosten, hosts an end of year celebration at the House with a rijstafle while Roundtable is celebration of community as guests and House ground "networking" in their own lives.

Contradiction: Pouring the concrete for the next steps when the forms are not in place. (Week 11)

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: Divine Word Fathers (SVD) confirm contribution of \$50,000. Plans for two Rural Development Symposia (October 8 and 15) are made. Schedule for year's Seminars for Effective Mission is set and ready to be printed. First draft of 'La Voce d'Italia' Italian translation is typed.

Internal: E. G. camp and July Council reports are heard upon the return of Jerry Bayer and the three children from Frankfurt, and Maureen Jenkins from Chicago. Michelle Balm celebrates her fifth birthday. Correspondence typing job resumes with research doctor.(7) A series of helpful collegiums enabling a gestalt of strategic questions needing to be answered at council and the sharing of the Balms' wisdom on religious orders precedes finalization of the Balms' departure date for India.(8)

Contradiction: Anticipating and thinking through three weeks of work in the few days left before Council. (Weeks 7&8)

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

External: Letter from WHO head office in Geneva finally confirms IERD co-sponsorship and outlines working relationships for ICA-WHO for the next two years. D'Souza, Jennings-Teats and Banks rendezvous in Oslo to refute academic's report from India, and establish a new and better working relationship with NORAD. Health core meets to establish structure for on-going work in Stockholm and Copenhagen.

Internal: Flemming Baasch (7 years) flies home alone from Frankfurt E. G. camp after a stimulating encounter with the global.

Contradiction: Forming a self-support model which really works in a nation undergoing economic surgery. (Week 5)

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Evening at The Institute draws 10 with main feature slides of Portugal project revealing "Third World" dimension of Europe; invitation to RDS Oct. 28-29 composed, translated and readied for printer; meeting with contact from eastern bloc country of Hungary reveals solid commitment to IERD.

Internal: Christel Otro arrives from Germany for two-week sojourn; Romanian family is sent out to continue studies in USA; Cathy Bayer is sent out to resume work in Portugal; Joe Dixon and two daughters arrive to visit Europe's most fascinating city - Vienna.

Contradiction: Pulling together the necessary appointments and at right level of bureaucracy to gain IERD decisions, funding and momentum. (Week 12)*

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: Year of Order Council is initiated with Area Council, focused on planning HDTI which integrates traditional curriculum with ongoing program activity and expansion. Gandhi readings and film along with Eid Al Adha (Islam's celebration of Abrahams' sacrifice of son) were distinct markings.

Internal: House welcomes back Fardos Yusef and Patrick Crump from Academy and discontinuity in time for Council and Cairo celebration.

Contradiction: Designing and translating HDTI curriculum approval for Egyptian situation when not having full time bilingual faculty to assist with school. (Week 11)*

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: IERD mailing prepared. Cluster operations manual written. Contact with Phillips Petroleum renewed.(8) Bill and Andy Parker go to Brobo. Marie is sent out and Jacques is received as an intern.(9)

Internal: The team begins to gather and celebrates year with dinner and a movie.(8) Celebration marks return of Bill and Andy Parker from Brobo with readings from E. B. White and reports.(9)

Contradiction: Getting a clear comprehensive plan of the next three months. In the midst of starting the year, dealing with the ambiguity of the money and troop situation. (Weeks 8&9)

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Project visitation team in Jos Region, sponsored by Plateau State Ministry of Rural Development, joins ICA to look at six projects for possible IERD documentation; the six members of the team represent four sectors.

Internal: House celebrates completion of 1981 ICA Finance Statement by Arthur Young, Osindero and Moret, and secures inkind commitment.

Contradiction: Daring to discern the long range collegial structure that builds and sustains the Movement while enmeshed in implementing IERD. (Week 10)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Village Development Association meets with 30 present and begins struggle of financial responsibility for the project. Orientation Weekend with eight prospective staff reminds all of us of our covenant to care, village meeting of 68 at remote site starts first step of expansion experiment and site visit of 26 students from 11 nations from Pan-American Institute snaps us to attention with the demonstration power of the HDP's. Three teams on the move with RDS in Titwe; second week of preschool teachers training by Zambia Preschool Association; and advertising booklet nears completion. Matoma Steering Committee meets to continue strategies for IERD funds. Third teacher house in construction. Village P.T.A. collects funds from each family. Lion's Club of Lusaka organizes health camp at Kapini HDP.

Internal: Expansion collegium opens a new door of contemplation when we balloon the concept of expanding to other provinces within Zambia. Week 2 celebration honors end of preschool teachers training and British Volunteers six month of service while two staff prepare for teaching at International School of Lusaka. Immigration strategy points to permeation breakthroughs, collegium on expansion is mind expanding as the House looked at the entire nation. Mike Haamungomo announces his engagement to Wendy Chikatula.

Contradiction: Absolving tension through clarification of roles while maintaining integrity with mission. Demonstrating integrity with the Dinner-Dance fund raising while dealing with practical issues. Searching for a tactical plan when everything is on hold. (Weeks 9,10,11)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Government Authorisation letter arrives for Zimbabwe IERD fund raising and we receive first draw of NORAD grant for 1,130,000/-, both representing major breakthroughs. Project directors and four New Volunteers fill three vehicles heading for projects after extended project directors meeting which deals successfully with finance. ICA attends interagency funding conference on women in development at invitation of UNDP.

Internal: House receives John Telford and Anne Dodge en route to Zambia. Joe Slicker, Charles and Kaira Lingo back home as we anticipate area planning.

Contradiction: Building support structures for NVM as the design of area planning for the new year comes clear. (Week 10)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: This is a week of many site visits from Freedom from Hunger, introducing rabbit raising to the families doing intensive gardens; USAID, funding the breast feeding health training programme; and Barclays Bank, considering general funding of the New Village Movement. Six volunteer village health caretakers from Katina (1), Muslim (2), Kawangware (2) and Kamitha (1) all in Kawangware sub-location complete two months of intensive health training and are prepared to work with the Kabiro Clinic for 6 months to improve health training in their village. Kabiro staff participates in Ndimi Consult in Keranyaga District, location impact in Kigumo Division, Murang'aa District, and the New Skills Training School in Sevagram, India.

Internal: Hubert returns from India while Sam returns from Ndimi and leaves for Project Directors' meeting and Jeremiah returns from Kigumo and leaves for Kikera as all celebrate using the new gas cooker.

Contradiction: How to maintain the momentum of development when all meetings must be legally approved until after the elections on 26 Sept '83. (Week 8)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Every project is visited in five days by section team to hold missional conversations and deliver stipends. Global film is shown to Kitale Rotary to follow-up Saboti Cluster water proposal, all done by that auxiliary. Lugari Division (in Kakamega District) village meetings and Busia District village meetings are held in preparation for cluster consults and new project house sites.

Internal: "Blue shirts savings account" manoeuvre is victorious as whole Kalwani House receives tailor-made shirts and blouses and reflect on commitment involved in decision of buying own blue and wearing it.

Contradiction: Sustaining the corporate life in the Houses during year's end pause for area planning and national elections. (Week 11)*

NAIROBI—THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: In the past week, we held a fantastic VLC in the division for three days with 50 people, a Locational Assembly in Kinyona with 20 people, and a Community Workday with 153 people cementing the collegium floor for community center.

Internal: The House hosted Larry Philbrook from Section C for VLC, sent Nelson Sayia to Gatuto for setting up the Week 7 Consult and Patrick Mbulu to hospital.

Contradiction: Operating out all programmes in the midst of conflict government meeting and limited House finances plus scarcity of water. (Week 5)*

MOMBASA—THE KAMWELENI HOUSE

External: The Village Development Committee with the help of ICA staff submitted companies proposal documents to private sectors for the Nguluku community centre materials. The Government District Officer accepted the motivational ICA style in initiating methods on community total organization which resulted in upgrading the public road and came up with 16 K-M road repair.

Internal: The House welcomed two section great circuiters (John Kivuva and Larry Philbrook) during the week of stipends distribution. It was a great week of celebrating for staff interchange. The House sent Paul S. Kilouzo with his new decision of marrying Mary Kithuka to the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: How to reschedule Quarter I time line cautiously in light of leftover Weeks 9 & 10 activities. (Week 12)*

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: Ashram celebrates India's 36th Independence Day with villagers on August 15th. On the same day we celebrate the cultural celebration, Saint Sawata Mali, which honours the establishment of the Mali Society. Tap water for future community centre was installed.

Internal: Council team arrives in Maliwada and starts preparation. House starts Ashram garden to supplement budget. D.P. Kolankar starts teaching practice in Deogiri High School to get his teaching certificate towards starting a class in Aurangabad next year.

Contradiction: Engaging ourselves and village leaders to prepare for Continental Council and cluster programme on time. (Week 8)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Economic module is initiated in the cluster; representatives visit RCF Co. and Jawale Industry Exhibits; Ambar Charkha programme is on computer. Training Centre and Chikhale bridge construction continue; a 67 foot wall is completed for AB Parts, and the tap water system for Chikhale and Moho is eight feet short of completion which the MIDC agrees to connect.

Internal: People from Hoechst Co. are hosted for economic modules and House sends staff to cluster villages for actuation and planning meetings. Chikhale and Area team work on Maruti Babhale's passport and visa for the Nairobi GRA.

Contradiction: Dividing and imaging responsibility for the mission so the risks can be won while holding the tension of the external task and the internal life. (Week 6&7)

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Two CYFs are held for 75 students in Deogaon Ashram School and 61 students in Vaitarna High School. Three Adivasi people are sent from cluster village, Chandrachi Meth, to Nasik for driving course. Three day cluster consult has 70 people participating.

Internal: Principal Mr. M. S. Gosavi of Byr College visits Vaviharsh Ashram and talks on NSS Camp. Ashram receives new paint and decor and internal life training begins for new staff.

Contradiction: Completing cluster documentation as soon as possible so that it can be shown to four-sector people. (Week 7)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: With the paperwork now complete, BAIF inspect the site of their second proposed percolation tank in Jawale. Villagers receive an unexpected call from the BDO who later accompanies BAIF's site visit. Rs1,000 from the S.S.S. organization are received to assist the cluster's health programme.

Internal: Cluster newsletters are printed for distribution. The EG at last have two new benches to suit their size and the House sends out Kevin Boivin to Fifth City after working in Jawale for one year and in India for four.

Contradiction: Completing our tasks effectively with time, money and transportation threatening to disrupt the programme. (Week 6)

PUNE—THE MAALE HOUSE

External: Wadgaon Preschool survey is completed with 91 children whose parents are ready to pay Rs 10 each. Actuation of Maale lift irrigation scheme continues with additional signatures and a joint meeting is held with Mudsinghi. Sewing class opens in Maale.

Internal: Makwana family joins Maale Ashram bringing skills in sewing and embroidery. Development team of A. Paul and A. Algoankar spend week in Kolhapur and Sangli.

Contradiction: No contradiction submitted; (Weeks 9,10)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: Buldard engineers submit building estimate and drinking water is repaired. B.A.I.F. advises Budhoda village people about future planning. Shivaji holds birthday fair and Budhoda village people participate. New information about Ambar Charkha industries land arrives as Budhoda builds Ambedkar statue.

Internal: House has celebration with Area Team member Ambaji Kamble.

Contradiction: None submitted (week 5)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: House tiles for demonstration walls in five houses each in Mandurgad and Nandora are donated by The Centre of Science for Villages. Pipes are distributed for drainage in Sevagram and Karenji Kaji. Ambar Charkha programme takes another leap as five more units are supplied to both Piyai and Bhankheda from Gandhi Ashram, who also supplied bales of cotton (raw material). Women's Awakening Institute report is printed and distributed to four sectors. Village Leaders Conference is held in Sevagram with nine villages from two clusters represented. Seventy-five people come to the opening ceremony of this two day programme where the Block Development Officer gives a great, practical keynote talk. This programme decides on twelve common programmes for the block which will focus the participation of (four sectors) action guilds in agriculture, environment and social arenas.

Internal: House shramdan is held to prepare for VLC including new decor, then follows it with great celebration. Kokane and Yeshoda Varma are sent out to Area Meeting in Jawale. Mohan Borker finally gets his full driving license for the jeep. Massive food credit bill of Rs4,000 is finally paid off.

Contradiction: Using the time until troops come back and quarter planning is done to prepare for the coming quarter. (Weeks 11,12)

NAGPUR—THE TEMBHURWAHI HOUSE

External: 750 cluster villagers witness the opening of the Mahatma Gandhi Statue by the Hon Mrs Yashodhara Bajaj, Maharashtra State Minister for Public Works. Prominent among the VIP guests are Mr Potdukhe MP, Mr Mamulkar MLA and the Collector. Tembhurwahi leadership works around the clock during 36 hour timeline to set up space, collect Rs 183 expenses and deliver 200 invitations. The event is reported on All India radio and in four newspapers. Dr Amin from DRDA checks the bakery trainees and the bakery plot is measured. Sirsi Mahila Mandal lodges application to the District Industries Centre for chili grinding machine.

Internal: NST students Gopal and Sudhakar impact the Ashram with new skills in English and profound witness. WCDs volunteer Fiona is sent out to her new assignment in Faridabad cluster, and the Ashram welcomes home Vinod and the Neware family.

Contradiction: Empowering the CDA leadership so that it becomes a whole-village, participatory dynamic and cluster demonstration. (Weeks 9 & 10)

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: Preschool shed is built in Jambron and Medhda holds shramdan and meeting with Gram Sevak. Managing Director of Village Bank in Pradhpur adopts six cluster villages.

Internal: Wood is obtained for Ashram repairs, S. Sawarkhed arrives from Sevagram and Prasad family is sent out on discontinuity. Marathi classes start.

Contradiction: Setting up Global Women's Forums without any educated women on the staff. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Area House in Dhoj Village completes 3-day Area Council launching the year with three strategic thrusts - Expanding Area Networks through five RDS' and six PDL's, demonstrating Cluster Human Development and forming Disciplined Order Life. Annual Appeal gears up with establishment of "Hong Kong" system and arrival of Nexus forces to complete the Area Team. House hosts Sir James Lindsay for cluster site visit and meets Nuchem Company conducting health survey in the villages towards prevention of blindness program for children.

Internal: House settlement, total space care, new collegium room decor and roof top celebration feast with dancing build our readiness for Quarter II as a team of 12 adults and eight E.G.

Contradiction: Designing configurations to ensure victory on the seven fronts for the week. (Week 12)*

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Health meeting in Gunjurpalya (Eye Camp) involves 8 colleagues from the four sectors and 90 local participants representing four cluster villages. The three most prestigious Chambers of Commerce in Madras city agree to co-sponsor the forthcoming Madras RDS and hand over their cheques. With the completion of the state-wide Andhra Pradesh RDS, the number of RDS grads in Southern India totals 226 from 123 organizations (7). All requirements are completed for free electrification of 50 houses across the cluster for low caste and low income families. Three lawyers from High Court come to Dinay and agree to write up land rights petition for families who have built houses on government land (5).

Internal: House participates in Independence Day celebrations and find it a good time to reflect on covenant, vision, and commitment (7.) Stuart and Samson go to Hyderabad for RDS and Canara Bank consultancy. Ramesh goes to Sevagram for Cluster meeting. The rest of us worry about illegal electric connection of our house, stove repairs, and a district-wide kerosene shortage (for cooking and non-electric lighting) (5).

Contradiction: Prioritizing our response to overwhelming demands and opportunities. Keeping a move on when the practices (stove, electricity, kerosene) seem to take all the time. (Weeks 5-7)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Rental agreement is signed for new facility. First move in seven years signals solid economic upward mobility within the Bustee from 16 Ahiripukur, 2nd Lane to 3B Ahiripukur 1st Lane. Programme requests continue to be received from RDS participants.

Internal: House sends out Shankar Jhadav and Bhimrao Tupe to new assignments in Global Management and Global Development Centrum. Reunion of the remnant is celebrated at local hotel.

Contradiction: Mobilizing systems to move House, initiate Annual Appeal, conduct 10 PDL's and be ready for the beckoning future. (Week 10)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Preparation and set up is already underway on RDIW's in seven locations continues to gather momentum as three teams depart for Malang (Oct. 20), for Palembang (Oct. 13), and for Muntilang (Oct. 24).

Internal: Tuekes' depart for Continental Council in Hong Kong, and Rich MacKay arrives from Brussels. House Emerging Generation has swim party at the International School. House readies itself for three new arrivals.

Contradiction: How to adequately context people arriving when everything is going full tilt. (Week 11)*

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Regional preparation begins for Rural Development Symposium while data for the four year report continues to come in to be organized and analyzed.

Internal: The House 'Female Dynamic and Continent' returns - one from Academy, one from Priors check signal meeting.

Contradiction: Landing the four year report while launching the Area Manoeuvre on RDS's and the Regional Manoeuvres for Quarter II. (Week 10)*

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: A training module proposal is sent to the Socio-Economic Development Unit of the Prime Minister's Department at their request and an informative LENS follow up visit is made to the advisor of Bank Negara as part of the overall strategy to build up a programmatic track record with the public sector (7). 1982-83 Audit Document Report completed and delivered to auditor and we receive \$2,000 contribution from Readymix Concrete (6). Second LENS for this month successfully held with 35 teaching and administrative staff of the Workers' Institute of Technology in Pandamaran. Participants begin with great apprehension and conclude by describing the consensus to move as "a miracle". Participant observers from the Transport Workers Union provide future access for LENS marketing with the Trade Union sector in Malaysia (5). LENS held successfully with Dataprep, a Malaysian computer sales and service company, for 25 of their managers and staff. Follow up session reveals that one of the key tactics of horizontal communication was implemented with a company wide meeting where six non-managerial participants took the company through the LENS charts (4)

Internal: Kevin Grady sojourns with us on his odyssey across the globe and the Gilgrens leave for Medan after their brief discontinuity at the KL house (7). The Gilgrens arrive to spend their discontinuity and the House sends out Ken Fisher to Brussels and begins quarter planning with a series of brooding conversations (6). V. Pathmanathan, recent Academy grad and colleague, has his first experience teaching LENS. Late night conversations with Ken Fisher give the house a welcome opportunity to have a third dynamic as we discuss issues ranging from corporate culture, to sexuality, Order history and intentional style (5). Mary Hoff and Ken Fisher's presence as LENS staff bring interchange to the KL house in a new way. K.P. Choong, our board member, has his first experience in teaching LENS. At the end of LENS, the house takes a trip down to the historic town of Malacca (4).

Contradiction: With the completion of the 1982 audit and the approach of the Annual General Meeting of ICA Malaysia, how do we adequately think through and be prepared to launch the House and the Board into another year, sensitive to the public profile needs. As the time for the next Annual General Board Meeting of the ICA Malaysia draws near, imaging and scheduling it in such a way as to fit with everyone's schedule. (Weeks 4-7)

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: The staff working together with villagers and ABRI (Army of Republic Indonesia) on physical development village project in Kecamatan Maros Baru builds a new road in Panjalingan, installs electricity in Tambua and Tangkuru, and builds a new well for drinking water in Pajukukang in two weeks' work days. A second new post guard is installed in Bontoa and cluster documentation continues.

Internal: The House participates in celebration for Headman's new baby. Rochmat goes to Jakarta for Singapore Area check signal meeting. Badminton games as sport activity continue regularly.

Contradiction: Creating more possibilities for the team and villagers to work together to speed development activity as the dry season comes. (Weeks 8,9)*

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: LENS with DOW-MERRILL is building stakes for the future of the Manila House. The follow-up evaluation is in December. The IERD Regional Steering Committee produces the first draft of Bohol Documentation.

Internal: The Manila House sends out Don and Claudia to the Priors Meeting in Hong Kong and welcomes the arrival of Tricia and the two guests at House Church after having a regional meeting to have a feel for the future of the Manila House. We celebrate by seeing the movie "Flashdance".

Contradiction: Relying on one person to keep track of the whole running smoothly. (Week 12)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Proposal for year-long training program for Time Inc., Asia, is created and submitted.

Internal: House has party to celebrate Jack's 39th birthday.

Contradiction: Locating the gas to power our IERD Implementation Vehicle. (Week 4)

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Bi-lingual team conducts one-day training in problem-solving method in Ping Tung Co. with 20 social worker supervisors of the Provincial Department of Social Affairs opening another channel for further work with the government. Hai Ou Slide Show comes off in midst of relaxed there-must-be-a-projector-around-here-somewhere style of Taoyuen Rotary. And our mailman (a Roundtable member) helps us get out 103 Updates (11). Three people return from Area Council in Sudtonggan, and a whirlwind week sees the IERD Steering Committee finalize the budget and funding plan, development brings in \$1200, and the September Update goes to the printer. As part of the growing participation in the rural development network, ICA is invited to join the launching exercises for the national chapter of the International Young Farmers Exchange program (IYFE) (10).

Internal: Collegiums on Internal Life, The Year's Program, and Continent SEAPAC prepare Gordon and Roxanna for send-out to "Check Signals" meeting and Gordon claims this as The Week of Five Cities: Monday-Kaohsiung, Tuesday-Ping Tung, Wednesday-Taoyuen, Thursday-Taipei, and Friday-Hong Kong (11). After participating in Area Council, Paicy Chu decides to remain in Philippines to sojourn, and Bill Bigelow visits Central Philippines University, which his grandfather helped to establish (10).

Contradiction: Getting ahold of people during holiday week (Chinese Moon Festival) to confirm and prepare for first IERD Advisory Board event. Revitalizing internal life structures to allow fresh appropriation of the new year. (Weeks 10,11)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: The roof of Poultry Building 1 is under repair following Typhoon Bebing which strikes Tiwi Municipality with 220 kph winds, destroying 50% of the homes in Putsan. Five sacks of rice and 100 dressed chickens are distributed to 156 families who are victims. Poultry Building 2 for layers and broilers, and our new administration building are under construction. Putsan athletic team competes in Tiwi Fiesta Sports Test with 35 joining the 10 km run. Barangay health worker prepares profile on rural health unit for seminar. Second-hand jeepney is purchased for village. NPC geologies agrees to coordinate watershed project with Tiwi cluster partnership and donates 500 ornamental seedlings for Putsan beautification as school compound is landscaped and road widened (8).

Internal: Baby de Luna from Philippine Geothermal, Inc., in Manila, and Mila Cioson from Tiwi visit Putsan. Elizabeth Caperton arrives from Hong Kong. The staff studies "Man and Development" and adds a women's room to House.

Contradiction: Managing Puroks and Barangays to create economic venture and renovate buildings during absence of ICA staff for Area Council. (Week 8)

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: Our Island meeting with a workday is held in Barangay Catarman, new plots are ready for planting our palaya and we circuit to the ELNC. New PPA officials are elected for all Mactan-24 ELNC centers (1). Area Council in Cebu is a grand event featuring reports from all regions, five task forces (in-service training, development, budget, Order Day and IERD), plenary of the whole session, two weeks of Betamax with many films, house beautification and a celebration on the beach. Preschoolers from the entire 24 preschools have a field trip, the eggplants are harvested and one container of rock is delivered to Manila. (12,13)

Internal: New House structures allow all facilities to be reset in the midst of sending out the Putsan staff, Jean Taylor and Edward Vergara. We received a Japanese work camp time design and delivered one container of rock to Manila (1). The House is swirling with the arrival and send out of Area Council delegates. The celebration of the Aguirangs' and Cramers' wedding anniversaries, four birthday celebrations (Fed Estogio, Paisy, Pat DeSpain and Bernandito Rosalda), Jaime Vergara's visit to the Sudtonggan Preschool, Nemeth Estorgio's reception as a youth and an urban celebration (12,13).

Contradiction: Facing the reality of the internal life. Figuring out for Cebu Region role in development. (Weeks 12,13,1)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

External: MSSD distribute the third batch of rice to drought victims. Monthly baby weighing is completed and reported this quarter. Mr Cesar Gante donates lumber for Langub preschool building. Highlight of the year is the 5th Anniversary Fair for LHDP and Mountain Cluster Project, attended by the Ministry of Health, POPCOM, MSSD, BPI, MEC and two international staff from Manila and 200 people from the cluster.

Internal: Cluster workers participate in house painting and repair and extending road to the highway.

Contradiction: Beginning the think-tank for next year's work and developing proposals for different agencies to support the program. (Week ?)

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

Internal: The Japanese Foreign Ministry decides to send one delegate from their Ministry to the IERD. Toemachi calls to schedule a second T.M. after the first T.M. solved the community's water problem. Hong Kong Nexus stays after Area Council to set up 21 development calls and write proposals (9). Area Council gathers in Hiou City for eight days in which reconfiguration and four year strategy are major themes. All members of Japanese Houses, colleagues, Nexus and Seoul representatives give in-put to new decisions. ICA Board of Directors meet to hear reports of Chicago and Area Council, update on Japan IERD, and reflect on reconfiguration. A positive and responsive support for the year (8).

Internal: 1982 Academy Grad Takako Kowamura announces her decision to intern in the Tokyo House. First step of reconfigurations send out Pattersons to Osaka House with a sushi party (9). Celebration of life's journies with Paul Patterson's 8 birthday and David and Joyce Reese's 32nd anniversary (8).

Contradiction: Drawn out reconfiguration schedule delays Tokyo regional planning and implementation. Moving rapidly but with great strategic care to cover new configuration. (Weeks 9&8)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Work continues on IERD village selection and funding. A key funding visit was made to Chung Buk Province to meet the head of Home Affairs, Mrs. Lee Sung Woo.

Internal: The returning trio from Brussels, Park Yong Chul, Min Sung and Han Kyung Ae pass on their way home.

Contradiction: Pulling together all the people and pieces to organize a great Regional Council next week. (Week 9)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: The team holds a cluster leaders meeting to reflect on the past work and talk about issues; holds an artform conversation workshop with 175 university students and professors in Cheong Ju Teachers College; and visits Prof. Kim who visited Nairobi GRA and the beginning of the 37th Global Academy (11). The teams attend funeral service of colleague, Director of Kolea Children's Foundation, and is impacted by the demonstration of his life of missional service (10). Workshop on past three months of HDZ work surprised us as we become aware of expansion of people, organizations and structures in Zone that have been impacted by events (9).

Internal: Kang Eun Sim is starting the journey of intern year and House has an implementation workshop of Regional Council on 10th. The team prepares Korean R/T materials for last three weeks in Quarter I (11). The team prepares for Regional Council with participation in the Global Fast using poverty, chastity, obedience exercises. Regional Council signals turning point in building collegiality and concrete plans for the Year of Order Council (10). The Team of Mr. Min, Mr. Park, Miss Han were welcomed back from Global Academy. The House buys 22 chairs, transforming the space and Makes IERD symbol and Order Polity symbol. House makes new teams reflecting return of staff and the receiving of two new university students as sojourners (9).

Contradiction: Being tight in the midst of celebrative mood of Chu Suk. Swirling together the infinite possibilities in a refreshing new era, into one corporate thrust. Rebuilding momentum for holding re-scheduled Regional Council. (Weeks 9,10,11)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: Town Meetings are now scheduled for Miyazaki in October and set tentatively for Okinawa in the fall. A kyushu village movement leader has invited us to participate in a series of Symposiums. The 10-day Area Council works through hard issues of reconfiguration. Mr. Tsukamoto is elected ICA Director from our Region (9). We had a great Regional Council with 15 people held in donated space where we will be holding our Friday night Roundtables beginning next week. Advisors and Colleagues insist that our "Reconfiguration in April" is a working decision and they plan to work on changing it. The video with Kingsley's pitch generates even more interest and discussion was lively over sushi and beer at the close. (11)

Internal: Fire, spreading from a neighbor's house two doors away, makes one-third of our House unuseable. The upstairs collegium room is gone while Jean and Adia Hanson's and the Reese's rooms are heavily damaged by smoke and water. Losses are Not covered by insurance. ICA members, friends, colleagues and students are responding magnificently with gifts of money, food, drink, bedding and most of all, practical assistance and advice in finding a new apartment down the street where our two Japanese Volunteers, Jean and Adia now live. A benefit dance sponsored by The Chuckwagon, a Country Western Snack Shop whose Master is an ICA member, give 140 people a chance to make contributions, visit, hear about ICA and enjoy a marvelous three hours of dancing and singing. Here at the House space arrangements are being sorted out and normal life is resuming (9). Five donated tables and enough chairs from a 2nd hand place, plus a new white board and a start on decor help us get into the mood again as the Landlord promises us one-third back on our deposit and the House celebrates Jean Hanson's 39th birthday and David Reese's 54th birthday with cake, presents, parties and festivities appropriate to the days. (11)

Contradiction: Telling the "New Life From Ashes" story to the Region and Area. Focusing on the Area Council Vision for the Order while creating a firm base of movement leadership here in Fukuoka while moving out of the limbo caused by the fire and decisions about re-configuration. (Weeks 9,11)*

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: In the midst of preparing Higashi-Yoshino Town Meeting, Suita City sets date of October 24th for a Women's Forum. Two week calendar introducing the Pattersons to the region and the advisors is in place. A one year program report is completed to start new membership renewal campaign.

Internal: Jim and Paul Patterson arrive in Osaka and get Paul enrolled in the Canadian Academy beginning Monday, two bicycles are bought and one sojourner asks about longer term training with an assignment to Africa.

Contradiction: Prioritizing the immediate possibilities that are here to ensure the long term regional care needed. (Week 10)*

THE SAPPORO HOUSE

External: Endorsements for volunteer symposium include Hokkaido newspaper, Hokkaido Board of Education, and local foundations. Meeting room and printing are inkinded. The Regional Team meets three times concerning new Japan House reconfiguration.

Internal: Manami Kitamura returns from Academy with great excitement and concern for training of second language speakers. Karen Ellsworth, Maxine and Teresa Butcher are sent out to new assignments. Alexander Tonosaki symbolizes end of his covenant with the Order at Sunday celebration.

Contradiction: Building our polity to meet the needs of transition times. (Week 11)*

AREA SYDNEY

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: An "Action Planning" one-day consultancy with store managers of McDonald's provides them with the first time to have been together and have dealt with the future of their company in any way. House spends the evenings and Week II in preparation toward the Australia Annual Appeal, and Newcastle colleagues hold a meeting to prepare for an October Regional Council to be held in Newcastle.

Internal: Excitement reigns as facility team discovers a place that will house any families necessary for \$1/month until December, and holds the possibility of becoming our training centre. A meeting with solicitor and auditor clears the way to establish the legal basis for Microconnexions. Sandy and Frank are off to SEAPAC check signals meeting in Hong Kong; Clare and Ken Whitney stop long enough to share Tonga stories on their way to Hong Kong; John Walmsley arrives for a week sojourn and Robert Robins arrives for time with his family.

Contradiction: Creating the systems that launch varied thrusts in the midst of a facility focus. (Week 11)*

SYDNEY-THE MURRIN BRIDGE HOUSE

External: Community initiates long-range planning meeting, invites government representatives, local schools, ICA and residents, and does all facilitation. Solid plan is built toward professional trade education, full employment, and economic self sufficiency.

Internal: Area Council launches the Year of Order Council in Area Sydney with profound dialogue over being the Religious in history.

Contradiction: Firming up relations between Murrin Bridge and broader community structures. (Week 10)*

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Representatives from Sydney and Murrin Bridge Houses join us for IERD check signals meeting and plan trek to Alice Springs, N.S.A. meeting and National Laugh Gola event. Ten signal communities have returned data forms for IERD participation.

Internal: Eight E. G. and the Newkirk family go camping in the mountains during V.J.L., highlights being Scavenger Hunt and ice cream feast. Barry and Margaret celebrate completed life of mother Nita Claire Oakley age 93 yrs. She was a pioneer, active in the three great waves of history.

Contradiction: Figuring out what we can do for council rather than what the council can do for us. (Week 6)

AREA SUVA

APIA - THE NUKU'ALOFA HOUSE

External: The first National Rural Development workshop was opened by H.R.H. Princess Of'e'ina-Mei-Sangi of Tonga who came back the next day to participate in the RDW. Attendance went up to 250. Oceanic Industries lends an 8"x12" board for plenary sessions. While on the side of the events, donations for PTS in Ha'apai arrived bit by bit through mail. First three checks arrived totalling \$550.00 for the PTS (12). Thirty workshop leaders through at least two training sessions for RDS, are deeply excited about methods. Delegates arrive from outer islands for Symposium. PTS Faculty Day finishes with writing fundraising and training manoeuvres for next three months, and has fine cook-out and kava party with songs from four nations (10).

Contradiction: Maintaining our life together after the RDW's avalanching excitements and glueing the comprehensive for the next quarter. Remembering that there is life after the Rural Development Workshop. (Weeks 10,11)*

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

External: PAX closes in on first sale to 2500 member Roman Catholic Church. Annual Appeal provides 'piggy back' for IERD site visits and fall program set up and continues its momentum as 41 people pledge \$28,000 with nine film events to go.

Internal: Wednesday night collegium led by youth clarifies the objective school curriculum and reveals issues that will require effective model-building.

Contradiction: Getting effective model-building done during end of Annual Appeal and full thrust of the year's work. (Week 12)*

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: The Annual Appeal launched with assistance of Kevin Boivin and Lin Wisman from the Nexus, gets off to quick start with eight pledges totalling \$6,230. "Let Ben Do It" video extravaganza begins as 24 people attend first three showings with eleven more scheduled for next two weeks of Annual Appeal. Team finalizes plans for fundraising party; designs, prints and mails invitations; arranges program of Jazz Band, opera singer and pianist; and begins work on fine tuning the orchestration.

Internal: Sojourner Pam Eddy is sent out apple-picking, Kurt Dahlke registers at The Evergreen State College and the House discovers that laser surgery doesn't work on blue eyes, but Raymond is celebrating successful eye surgery by conventional methods.

Contradiction: How to accelerate the Annual Appeal and Spotlight on Success when we have to be in a new facility in one and a half weeks. (Week 12)*

THE PHOENIX HOUSE

External: Two new members are added to the newly formed Regional Advisory Board: William Mahoney, top-notch lawyer and Ronny Lopez of the Arizona Governors Board. Annual Appeal celebrates first week's pledges totalling \$2,521.

Internal: House is forced to swallow bitter medicine as it deals with realities of self-support and decides to send a member out-of-state for a quarter.

Contradiction: Maintaining the tension between Annual Appeal and self-support demands. (Week 11)*

THE DENVER HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal week yields circuits to three Metros and three video events, one attended by new contacts from Volunteer Fair. Programs continue with forum for PTA in local Elementary School. Rapid City, Gillette, and Casper colleagues renew commitment through circuit team (12). Annual Appeal campaign begins with a bang as 22 people pledge more than 50% of bottom line. Kick off meeting planned by Metro colleagues. Seventeen volunteers sign up for participation in ICA at Downtown Denver Fair (11).

Internal: Major work day includes Order Forms collegium on Impact Systems, then repairs house eaves' 90-year-old lumber, front doorbell and back door lock (12). Fine celebrative occasions include movie double feature of "Man From Snowy River" and "Flashdance" along with delicious curry meals by Vivian Paul (11).

Contradiction: Activating possible miracles with available Day I troops. Covering all bases with team divided between circuit and home. (Weeks 11,12)*

AREA EDMONTON

THE EDMONTON HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal gets underway in three regions with 24 visits in five days netting \$5,570 in commitments. The last of the IERD documentation visits are concluded and corrected briefs start returning from 10 of the 22 projects. With video equipment available for the Kingsley video a marathon movie weekend is held with Newman, Dudley Moore, Duval and other big stars.

Internal: David McClesky and Cathy Marsh move in to flesh out Annual Appeal teams in Edmonton Region, bringing important images from the Nairobi GRA during collegium time.

Contradiction: Building models for immediate implementation which will enlist full participation and resolve. (Week 10)*

THE ANCHORAGE HOUSE

External: Luke Titus, of Minto, says yes to being included on the Alaska Advisory Committee. Will Mayo attends the National Steering Committee meeting in Chicago as Alaska's representative. Over 100 invitations to Alaska Advisory IERD Committee meeting are sent.

Internal: Alan Stocking arrives for the summer and he takes on a phone answering job for the Daily News. Warren Crain, guardian from Seattle, stops by.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum when region is in summer mode. (Week 1)

AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: Regional Team experiences the power of corporately searching for "our" training center, especially when the "perfect" possibility is uncovered. Visit to Prairie View A&M stimulates interest in participatory methods within the college. Metro meeting refreshes with dialogue on responsibility for broadening contexts.

Internal: Collegium on Kenya replication sparks reflections on life demand in North American front. House celebrates with laser light concert and ice cream sundaes.

Contradiction: Keeping the continuity of mission going in the midst of shifting personnel. (Week 2)

THE DALLAS HOUSE

External: First of four sessions is prepared in response to request from Texas Instruments for us to do training using their content and our method. United Methodist reporter hires Bill Bailey as permanent manager of promotion. Visits continue with colleagues of the spirit movement in North Texas.

Internal: "Say Amen, Somebody" reminds us of the unique power of music to ground the word about life.

Contradiction: Finding out our expectations are already over. (Week 11)

THE MEMPHIS HOUSE

External: Inkind video player and color TV for Annual Appeal combined video footages so we have Kingsley, global village, and two Success Southern Style footages on each of four cassettes launched two Annual Appeal circuits netting 31 appointments seeing 41 people, receiving \$855 in hand out of a total \$2,120 pledged (12). Targeting, case statement writing and motivating decor place region in position to reach the bottom line for Annual Appeal: "The New Movement History." Ned Raun, NSC member from Winrock International, assigns Frank Baker to work with ICA as needed for Site Visit coordination. Mississippi Task Committees consense on date change for RDS to January 9-10, 1984 after considering the impact of state political climate and the recent interest from US Department of Agriculture in Mississippi's rural development strategy (11).

Internal: Recreated House structures and office space and celebrated completion of 1st operating week of new structures with home video on Saturday night (12). The whole House (10 adults, three youth and two E.G.) mapped out the new Quarter's internal life plan, then celebrated with a picnic in the park in the dark!(11)

Contradiction: Finding key money sources to fill the vacuum in donor base before the vacuum in program check arrives. Discerning how to work through tired, disillusioned base of donors to new foundation for Annual Appeal during 1983-1984's "New Moment in History."(Week 12,11)*

THE ATLANTA HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal is launched with circuit to Florida. Eric and Rod facilitate Association of Migrant Organizations Conference on Cross-Cultural Bridges: CBO's, Health, & Education during circuit and show up on the six p.m. news in Tampa. The Atlanta post sets-up eight events and raises over half of the bottom line on the phone (11). Bill and Annette Bingham participate with House members in N. A. Council newsletters sent out to colleagues (10).

Internal: Evening celebrations and morning collegiums mark the Annual Appeal urgency and signals it as a victorious event for the House (11). Whole House comes together for first time and celebrates Johnsons moving in, Dean Johnson's birthday, Erica Johnson's enrolling in Agnes Scott College, Eric Wellington moving in and the return from N.A. Council(10).

Contradiction: Making comprehensive decisions without the broadest possible mind. Visualizing the self-sustaining images and systems through which tools/models are created and meshed to launch Annual Appeal and Year of Order Council. Weeks 10,11)*

AREA CHICAGO

THE CHICAGO HOUSE

External: Continental Council begins to illuminate the three Global Priorities and allow us to celebrate the formation of the Bill and Lynn Edwards family. Lela Mosley returns from the Brussels Academy and Lily Fox goes to East Waterloo, Iowa to talk about the Fifth City Model to interested community people.

Internal: The House sends Sharon Heiges out to her new assignment in Madrid

Contradiction: Integrating the implications of the Year of Order Council with our local mission. (Week 10)

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE External: Westport teachers hold appreciation breakfast for 300 teachers and IERD steering committee meets. Week focused on Westport Cluster includes prep for teachers' appreciation breakfast, orientation session for School Advisory Council and the discovery that the Cluster is actually 10 schools, not nine.

Internal: The K.C. house is most interestingly active this week as four people are sent out to the Council, Sheahan Paul and Mark Rebstock arrive to see school open, and Brian Hawley celebrates his 15th birthday. Beginning of the new year symbolized by Lori acquiring a new job at law library, Brian, Stuart and Jerome arriving and moving into rooms, and Juliet beginning Community College.

Contradiction: Beginning and maintaining the balance between external mission, internal life, study and self support. (Weeks 8-10)

LORIMOR HDP

External: Rod and Priscilla Wilson, representing the NSC, trek to the Walthill, Nebraska project for IERD site selection. Colleagues Ruth and Ed Laning, of Indianola, Iowa, promoting 3rd World Partnerships, show slides of their 6-month work tour in ICA African and Indian projects. Annual Appeal video showings elicit interest and statements like, "Why can't we do a community cluster here?" and "This film says what you don't say. As experts with 30 years experience, you need to be more arrogant in talking about what you can do." (12) The K.C. Regional Council, at Crowder State Park in Trenton, Mo. focuses on the Year of Order Council at the points of the destinal and symbolic that sustain commitment. A visit with long term colleague Hugh Wilkins confirms that people will substantially fund the Year of Order Council. The Region launches the Annual Appeal with film showings to groups and discovers that the Kingsley video relates to our credibility and the slide show relates to our integrity and is more powerful (for this continent) when shown immediately after the other (11). Region holds first \$7,000 LENS (including expenses) with American Cablevision in Kansas City; CEO leads group in implementation session, and Ian Graham from Toronto makes it a bi-national team. Six regional team members in addition to the two houses attend the North American Continental Council which is viewed as a first-class prototype of working together as a total continent. Annual Appeal is launched in K.C. with a film event at Wilsons' at which most pledges are increased over last year and 20% of AA bottomline is pledged (9,10).

Internal: CIM checks arrive within one week turn-around time through the new management system. Three cheers for CIM and Global Management Centrum (12). The celebrational dimension of the Regional Council deepens a delight in collegiality through Don Raschke's witness, corporate sessions, sports, computer games and the fine group of youth in the K.C. House. (11) An expanded and remodeled office now houses the new Kaypro and copier; inked wall tile and carpet are installed in time for first gathering of the two regional houses. (9,10)

Contradiction: Taking all the threads of possibility and weaving them into one tapestry of engagement. Putting everything we have decided into manageable tracks so that activities can be prioritized to do the quarter effectively and in style. Giving form to the event which will enable the region to be the Year of Order Council. (Weeks 9-12)*

THE MINNEAPOLIS HOUSE

External: LENS on Eldercare with Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi in Rochester, Mn. reveals creative possibilities for shaping the future of healthcare within the mission of their Order. Annual Appeal is launched in grand style as regional team gathers for film kickoff event and works through strategy, story and names of people to be called, pitched, visited and invited to events. (11) Management by Mission training for the Governor's Job Training Office enters its fourth session as government employees wrestle with "your situation is never your problem" amidst changing structures, crises, and political maneuvers. Regional team is addressed by new responsibility for development and management of corporate ICA funds at great Continental Council. (10)

Internal: Lynde Lachman is sent out to return to school in Oregon and Justin Morrill arrives with stories and plans for Annual Appeal victories. (11) Region's Lake Woebegone, Minnesota skit takes third place at Council while youth cluster, Kitt Farrar and Burce Ellsworth, maintain 16 hour days engaging seven courses each in advanced high school program. (10)

Contradiction: Seeing the victory of the Annual Appeal - with doubled bottom lines on number of people and amounts pledged - versus finding ourselves in the midst of a protracted campaign. Pouring everything into Annual Appeal while taking full advantage of all the opportunities it opens up for IERD, marketing, and strategy. (Weeks 10,11)*

THE DETROIT HOUSE

External: Three thousand four hundred and twenty dollars is in hand for the Annual Appeal with \$16,432 pledged, \$200 in the mail and \$7,000 in proposals (12). Fourteen at regional team meeting launched Annual Appeal. Advertising firm of Walter Thompson contributes V.H.S. (11).

Internal: A new 40x T.V., three free lifetime memberships with the Video Club, and the introduction to a low cost dental care plan are inked (12). Thirty-eight people celebrated completed life of Atsumo (Artie) Matsuoka at Memorial House Church (11).

Contradiction: Breaking loose colleagues to a deepened sense of responsibilities for time and financial support. Developing new systems and approaches that work for Annual Appeal and regional release. (Weeks 11,12)*

THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: Visit to RDS project wins big YES to hosting five-county Showcase Forum with visions of launching a replication zone. Mid-North Indianapolis Partnership hold fourth 90-day Celebration and Planning event at Butler University with major emphasis on building and broadcasting the story of this urban HDZ. Participation in Hiroshima Day vigil lays groundwork for "Inter-Movement Think Tank". Private companies and public agencies volunteer technical services, printing, and professional practicum training for the new Mid-North Home Helps, Inc., now in its fourth week of preparing "welfare" mothers for employment in human service ventures. Kingsley/IERD video premiered in Indiana at the Debra Drown send-out to her new India assignment, in Kentucky at the Appalachia RDS Steering Committee session, and in Ohio at the Cincinnati Metro Council. Department of Local Government, State of Kentucky, contracted with ICA to facilitate a one day program where mayors and county judges met to design their own training program. Warren, Indiana (RDS community) agrees to host 10 county symposium.

Internal: Fifty guests crowd into the Gary and Pat Drown home to send out Debra to new India assignment. House attends State Fair and local cabaret. House launches new edge in symbolic life with adapted "YES" ritual for even weeks and a set of Daily Readings for odd weeks. New House decor rationale and new internal life design mark shift in consciousness to Year of Order Council.

Contradiction: Gathering momentum for a new leap across the region and figuring out where we are going to land. (Weeks 5-7)

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: Employment Task Force launches year's plan for increasing jobs in Loisaia with a day-long meeting attended by 34 people representing all four sectors. Annual Appeal gets off to a good start with four fund-raising events hosted by regional colleagues. All day Saturday training prepares six citizens of Rockaway, NJ to be team leaders in upcoming community LENS.

Internal: A series of collegiums establishes internal patterns and time designs for the year.

Contradiction: Keeping the home fires burning in the midst of massive program and development efforts. (Week 11)*

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: Rick Jones from Chicago meets Dorcas Rose on the road doing Annual Appeal throughout the region. Annual Appeal appointments are made from the House in preparation for next week. Meeting with HUD director opens doors for RDS sponsorship.

Internal: Ken and Dorcas apply for passports in preparation for their trip to China.

Contradiction: Getting Annual Appeal appointments to fit within our timeline. (Week 11)*

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: Secretary of Transportation, Republican Elizabeth Dole and her husband Republican Senator Dole agree to be listed on the invitation as supporters of the October 27th IERD benefit, giving us an exciting balance to our otherwise heavily Democratic list of endorsers. Team from House facilitates another planning event for Lutheran Churches focussing on Ministry to a pluralistic society. Annual Appeal circuits in D.C., Richmond, Petersburg, Charleston and Pittsburgh result in \$27,000 out of \$38,000 pledged (12). A team from House participates in Youth Retreat of Hereford Maryland United Methodist Church group. Hunger Project says yes to \$5000 grant for IERD and local task force meets to continue implementation of October IERD benefit (10).

Internal: Number of renters expands to eight, further stabilizing our self-support base through the hostelry program. Randell White begins after-school job at \$4.50/hour (12). Eight Lutheran seminarians move into House as renters for this semester. Larry Ward and Marcia Knight report on part II of Continental Council (10).

Contradiction: Being so busy with momentum of last year that stopping the world to decide Quarter II seems out of the question. Putting corporate power into our financial structures. (Weeks 10,12)*

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal contacts are the focus of the Week and Youth, John Powell and Abednego Barnes, participate in Annual Appeal visit to the Robinson family in Andover. Strategy session with Terry McKenna, V.P. at John Hancock Insurance results in a 30-day maneuver plan for corporate involvement in Training, Inc (12). The fifth Annual Student Leadership Conference was held at Northfield-Mount Hermon School in Western Mass. (where LiLin Hilliard and Tina Slicker are attending High School) with 55 attending. Eleven workshop leaders included three high school students and five college students. The event was videotaped to be made available for similar workshops. The Training, Inc. of Boston held a board meeting with old South church announcing an additional \$20,000 contribution. Plans were set for an October maneuver to raise \$50,000 from the private sector for Training, Inc. of Boston (11). Entire House participates in Continental Council followed by Regional

Team planning to ground the implications. Excellent meeting at Lt. Governors's office results in model to deal with Public Sector funding needed for Boston Training Inc. (10).

Internal: The Betamax purchased to show Kingsley provides House celebration with four movies during Week II. Repairs to collegium room windows provide a better outlook!(12) Collegium reports are action-filled with John Powell's report of one year in Kenya, Abednego Barnes report of one year in Peru, and Joy Wu's report on Academy in Brussels. The Bengels celebrate 10 years of marriage (11). School starts sending Kendra McCleskey to Mt. Holyoke College, Debra Griffin to Boston University, John Powell and Abednego Barnes to Cathedral High, Alison Bengel to 3rd grade and Joana Bengel to preschool (10).

Contradiction: Caring for the future of the Order by designing the local components of the Panchayat visit. Being able to pick up \$175,000 already committed for Training, Inc. Boston by securing additional \$100,000 in 60 days. Visioning beyond bottom lines to long range images centered on addressing social contradictions. (Week 10,11,12)*

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: In less than two weeks, three tenant possibilities for the cornshop surface for the Starks Enterprises Corporation. Cornshop tenant, Chintz cottage holds rummage sale at 10¢ an item and makes \$50. Danforth momentum continues with cable vision start-up, new bank considering a local branch bank and more input to north country festival album (11). Starks Enterprises Corp. meets in relation to tax filings. Community development block grant money results in town water system being installed. Fire department building addition is begun. Our town project has 44 through G.E.D, Control Datasoftware-Plato, and Economic Development Committee meeting (10).

Internal: House study of "In Search of Excellence" exposes rational mask; House welcomes Jessie Clements for Annual Appeal with community dinner at House (11). House returns from hog calling victory at Continental Council and Boston Regional meeting to garden overflowing with veggies (10).

Contradiction: Moving great possibility to real victory. Covering all funding needs (A money, B money, SEC money, woodworks, etc.). (Weeks 10,11)*

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: The first week of Annual Appeal ends with \$22,000 pledged and \$1,120 in hand. The Ontario Regional Steering Committee of the IERD reviews 32 documented projects and selects eight of them to recommend to the Canadian National Steering Committee. The context of the Year of Order Council brings new collegiality to the regional team producing talk all around of "we" and "our" responsibilities. In response to a suggestion from Lew Whitehead, the editor of the Toronto Star interviews Brian Williams and prepares an article on the ICA. Kingsley video is taken to CBC for possible broadcast on national TV.

Internal: The House begins the process of developing the time and space designs to undergird the work of the Year of Order Council.

Contradiction: Running down the hill of the program year without stopping at the top to get a clear sense of direction. (Week 11)*

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: Rev. Lester Settle and Professor Bill Hamilton of the Halifax Region attend the NSC meeting in Winnipeg and help choose the 12 national projects for IERD, three of which come from the Maritimes. Visits with the Quebec Federation of Agriculture, The Caisse Populaire and the Ministère d'Agriculture open up networks for Quebec's project selection. Annual Appeal Task Force sends out another 30 letters in Quebec (13). One third of Montreal Region's bottomline is committed in one week of Annual Appeal. Funding event exceeds targeted amount; colleagues reflect with us on it. Halifax circuit does IERD provincial documentation and Annual Appeal (12).

Internal: A quick overview of the Year of Order Council document and a fast with conversations on 'The Life of A Cell' allows for collegial depth reflection (13). Week of festivities with House guests from Taipei, Toronto and Chicago. Victoria Lyn prepares Chinese feast and Mira Fisher turns four (12).

Contradiction: Moving quickly in Quebec while finishing the project case studies. Creating and nourishing of spirit that lends greatest impact to action. (Weeks 12,13)*

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Area Council is held in Conacaste. Strategic picture for 83-84 involves seven thrusts. Area works through next phase of Conacaste Expansion together. Region Mexico City year calendar is finished during Week II.

Internal: Bill Slicker arrives and puts on strategic hat out of his experience in Latin America.

Contradiction: Getting Mexico mission and House structures started when Guatemala is demanding full time. (Week 11)*

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: Project Extension is symbolically inaugurated, with unexpected announcement by the primary school director at the Monte Grane independence day celebration of the new preschool "resulting from the extension of the Conacaste Project." Third preschool is opened in Aguasaldobregas 10km from Conacaste. Project friend and professional film-maker visits and tapes one hour of interviews for a fund-raising film, allows the team to experience new creativity in our supporters as they look for new ways to enable development in these tight economic times.

Internal: Guatemala and Mexico staffs come together for the first time this year and experienced the diversity of Mexico and Central America through reports, conversations and broodings on the task of caring for the whole area.

Contradiction: Transmitting images and operating style of the extension mode "to team and community over against the tendency toward "business as usual" style. (Week 11)*

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External: Following HDTI graduation of 60 village leaders, implementation treks are held in Portland and St. Andrew in 10 villages with 28 meetings creating 2 year tactical timelines. Blue Mountain Yallah's Valley Cluster treks are begun with Rotary volunteers. IDB and NCB make 3 site visits to Woburn Lawn with full page ad in Gleaner on Woburn Lawn loan programme. Mary and Alice are welcomed back from Nairobi GRA. Presentation is made to 5 Methodist Churches. Lecture given to Cornell University graduate students at UWI. Princeton student and Peace Corps volunteers visit Woburn

Lawn.(12-6) The Woburn Lawn Economix Development Cooperative Society Ltd. holds its Annual General Meeting and 3rd anniversary with officials from IDB, NCB and Co-op Dept. giving their praises. Alice Wright is re-elected as Chairman. Rotary International volunteer, Paul Crouch, who is Chairman of the Brother's Brother Foundation and former Managing Director of ALCOA in Jamaica, presents tools and books to the H.E.A.R.T. Trust and Library Service who present them to the Woburn Lawn Project through the Kingston Rotary Club. Pre Co-op meetings are held in the Blue Mtn. Cluster and 2 year tactical timelines are built in Yallah's Valley Cluster.(7)

Internal: House sends out Denison Pierre to Dominica and welcomes Rob and Nadine from the Global Council and Benjamin from the 6th grade rite of passage. House welcomes Bill and Dan Bingham on visit, holds celebration sending out a Dutch and an English volunteer and has first total House meeting in six weeks.

Contradiction: Filling full the practical implications of a replication strategy which pushes in new directions into unknown territory and sustaining, expanding and deepening the movement.(Weeks 12-7)

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: House created and began to implement an in-depth research model for the Provincial structures and Andean-Indian culture in preparation for the Continental GRA in Caracas. Printed new National Program Brochure. To expand the bee industry we inked more wood to build thirty new hives. Azpitia women's industry is organized with local director and coordinator (11). Materials purchased for women's handwork industry and women in Azpitia and other cluster community (San Luis) are practicing to begin work on actual products September 19. Market secured for products produced by November 15. House started a log book of events held in new training center - over 750 people have participated in events since June 1983. Twenty volunteers are working weekly with NSC now on project selection and funding schemes (10).

Internal: New internal structures for teams, external task sections and commissions calls forth people to play multiple roles. Celebrated the arrival of the Black family at an Azpitia theatre presentation of an Incan myth (11). Workdays are held plastering new dormitory rooms to prepare for new assigned staff and interns. Celebrated the arrival of new Canadian volunteer Mike Arnoni. Weekly Order Days are an address on old hands as well as new interns as we articulate past wisdom and push images for the future (10).

Contradiction: Remembering to launch the necessary bold moves while your plate is already full of interesting and significant things. Securing program funding rapidly to enable more time to do the program. (Weeks 10,11)*

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: Rafael Davilá visits and helps plan November - Two Week Continental Research Assembly, Continental Council, 3-week - Latin American Priorship Training School. GAB member John Phelps agrees to add 10 minutes on Caño Negro to "Kingsley" film and put all in Spanish. Vocational Journey Retreat is set for December (11). The House continues with preparation miracles for the September Human Development Methods Lab including 30 registrations, inkind donations set, league and Roundtable curriculum is done and budget is finalized (10). The House is in full-force preparation for its 4th Human Development Methods Lab with 21 persons recruited to date, menus, budget, curriculum, charts and assignments victories (9).

Internal: Juan José Osillo joins Las Minas House as first Venezuelan permeator. Resurgence Research project is begun (11). The House celebrates the Mays' 9th anniversary and sends out Juan José Osio to mechanics training in Las Minas (10). The Area Caracas Council celebrates and commissions its assigned troops to be on the edge of history and celebrates with Betamax (9).

Contradiction: The exact who, where, and how not yet established for November. Doubling the effectivity of our fully engaged forces. Re-structuring time, space and habits to accomplish a quality school. (Weeks 9,10,11)*

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: The House assists Regional colleagues in sponsoring a workshop on creative economics for areas of poverty. Twenty people from many organizations share their wisdom with the help of ICA methods. Many commit themselves or their contacts to serve as local community consultants (11). Approval of a \$4,000 loan to the Panaderia in order to build new building, buy new machines and oven, and better training for more varieties of bread is received. A great celebration marking the fifth year of the Panaderia and the next stage of legalization is held this week (10). Colleague participation in Roundtable, House Church and lunch visit give us new images and insights for planning session which results in new external assignments and great expectations for rest of the Quarter. Local guardian gives tour of berry farm and donates plants for new Sol project. New Santiago House hunt begins again after promises of donations or loans during recent USA visit (8).

Internal: The House is saddened to hear that "our" Order youth have been assigned elsewhere. We decide a new House dynamic must be created from within (11). House hunting continues for a new house, finances finished and ready for Justice report and a whirl of invitations for visits in Sol for the Newkirks' arrival back to Chile (10). House celebrates at fantastic Chinese restaurant many events of recent happenings such as Raul's birthday, Newkirks' return with \$300 and \$500 checks for development (8).

Contradiction: Keeping all of our thrusts integrated to the mission and not taking on nice to do things simply because we have the opportunity. Internalizing Chile's participation in RDS and IERD stands or falls on financial responsibility of the National Steering Committee. In the midst of the serious economic situation how to bring the optimism and willingness of our city colleagues to initiate and nurture rural economic ventures into play without undercutting the hard won local spirit of self confidence and need for self initiation. (Weeks 8,10,11)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: In three weeks development brings in about \$1900 including \$280 raised in Rio Bonito for purchase of a 16mm film projector. Community Centre Inauguration in Bracana (after 8 months of construction) is highlighted by speeches by several residents, ribbon cutting by the prefect and the sale of new community T-shirts. NSC meets to set-up sub-committees for fund-raising, project selection and publicity. Farmers in Bracana and Tatus hold the first meeting of the Bracana/Tatus Farmer's Association and elect officers. The team visited the new mayor in Rio Bonito who asks for a closer relationship in the future. Project selection committee studies and categorizes 20 IERD project summaries and decides to send form 2 to 12. The Bracana and Mata community clusters formalize their consensus of the year's directions by moving ahead on implementation. Rio Bonito office continues building linkages between ICA and municipal structures. The first community interchange takes place when four men from the Mata community have lunch at the House before spending an afternoon in Bracana visiting houses, chatting with

producers and principally looking around the community centre. Money raised on the ICA stall at the inauguration was used this week to fit glass in all the centre's windows. IERD keeps on schedule with forms 1&2 translated and ready to post to eleven possible projects, plus progress reports sent to UNDP and UNICEF.

Internal: House uses Roundtable to study the 82-83 Kenya report.

Contradiction: Involving the existing structures without destroying community momentum. (Weeks 4-9)

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: Ministry of Development and Cooperation is interested in a proposal for IERD funding. Friends of ICA, ASBI set up relative to legalizing Service Ventures. Service Ventures sends out substantial Hostelry and Computer Service mailings. Letter from WHO director general establishing working relationship to ICA, visit to NORAD in Oslo to correct an evaluator report, participation of colleagues and neighbors in the Cabaret with electrician deciding to attend Academy and volunteer for the Ivory Coast, while doing 8 Service Ventures contracts, ground the image of the resourceful remnant.

Internal: All guests and House are impacted by the premier showing of the Indonesian film.

Contradiction: Getting perspective which enables discernment of which decisions are immediate and which need to wait until Continental Council with the knowledge that all decisions are "eternal". (Weeks 4-5)

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: A Rural Development Symposium in Bangalore sponsored by the Canara Bank brings together 17 volunteer agencies and seven banks.

Internal: Seven people from the Nexus join 3000 in celebrating the marriage of Asaram Rokhade and Mangla More in Athwad, a former district project village. A blue sari, a journal and centerpiece gifts are given to symbolize their decision to be in the ICA. Nexus Order Day and fasting day with key reflection create a week of celebration of life.

Contradiction: Complexity in orchestrating year end demands tends to blur images of riding momentum. (Weeks 9)

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: Participation in Area Councils within the continent is preceded by extended collegiums on Priorities, Memorials, Nexus Experiment and Finances. We celebrated with Area Suva their receipt of the first scholarship for the next Pacific Training School. IERD visits continue in Hong Kong with presentations to Raj Yoga group and social services network which will culminate in a symposium next month. Linda is sent out to her assignment on New Delhi, having raised \$1125 towards her travel.

Internal: The image of creative dancing House sees in 'Flashdance' is very appropriate as Nexus enters this new year of experiment and the Telfords are sent out to their new assignment. Visitors come and stay for a meal: Daljit Singh from Tata Company, India spins us the exciting story of his company's social development and thrills the youth when he reveals himself to be an International Cricketer.

Contradiction: Ensuring the appropriate containers for the vintage wine of this year of Nexus experiment. (Weeks 7-9)

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: Meeting with Control Data Corporation in Minneapolis produces structure of data base for the IERD document. Donation of \$10,000 toward Order Council is received from colleague on top of \$50,000 Annual Appeal pledge symbolizing forthcoming support for the Year of Order Council.

Internal: First in a series of 44 house study constructs symbolizes seriousness relative to the Year of Order Council as we begin our new bi-weekly time design alternating task force work with study and research.

Contradiction: Massive vision of the Year of Order Council, particularly for the next quarter, is not captured in visible structures nor practical implementaries. (Week 12)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

TISCO commits Rs. 100,000 for June; and manoeuvre debriefing is highlighted by activation of regionalising IERD with Rs. 20,000 inhand for Banagalore RDS advertising brochure. The key contradiction lies in the arena of having June/July global assignments drain the momentum established towards July 31st. (Week 9)

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that an IERD Project numbering system was created and holds two guild nights one on Centrum space and one on the USA NSC meeting. Ten LENS International appointments are held and Image Enterprises is set up. Helen Haug gets a new contract job (full-time) with the graphics division of a Chicago firm. The key contradiction lies in the arena of in the midst of the orchestration of the preparation for next week's events ensuring the consideration of the situation we really have and the spirit depth which is needed. Week 13)*

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that for the IERD taskforce - this was the week to deepen the involvement of the Indian Steering Committee in the preparation phase of the IERD. In Bangalore RDS; M. B. Rudramoorthy participates actively not only in the process of the event but representing the IERD to the people gathered as well as to the whole public answering burning questions. In the same week Mr. Bhoopat Trivedi asks to be on the ISC but really offers to hold an RDS in Jamnagar for more local level in Gujrat. The breakthrough is experienced in the arena of RDS set up for which there are materials, guidelines and methods created and sent out to the Houses. The futuric contradiction for the IERD taskforce for the coming week 10 is limited utilisation of resources available to ensure the comprehensiveness of the IERD. (Week 9)

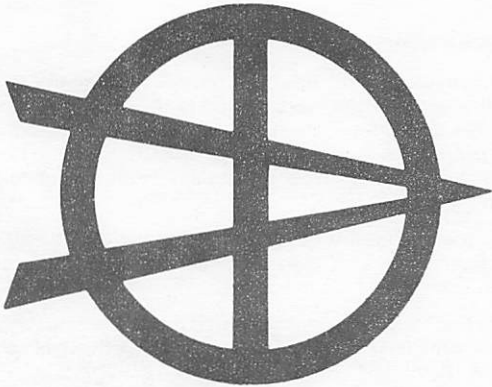
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Ten NSC members are visited and Week I meeting is set to select Spanish projects for India. Ministry of Labour contact is re-visited and gives further leads on IERD and ICA funding (13). Self-support is put into a seeable winning position as free schooling & uniforms are secured for the Armas children. House familiarizes itself with the regional file system and gets on top of the local turf through a series of collegiums and two outings, one a walking tour of old Madrid, the other a visit to the Prado Museum. House is cleaned and decored in time to move into Week II Quarter planning (12).

Internal: Jim Campbell arrives from Brussels and aids in Week II quarter planning sessions which give direction and "wheels" to planned actions. Regional Council is a time for planning and reflection with House & Academy grads. GAB member shares good reports he has heard about progress of IERD from other GAB members and we move into the year with four appointments set.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops to march into the battle on all fronts. Anticipating requirements for self-support and IERD prep in light of the very real time demands. (Weeks 12,13)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Training Center construction shifts into fourth year as village carpenters raise the roof, install window frames and start the inside walls, utilizing the expertise of the Portuguese Youth Program to build the bathroom and cement the rocks in the outside walls. A work day in Bigorne with the OTL paints street numbers on all of the houses for the post office. The Volvo is sold the same day the Toyota loses its clutch, leaving the House carless(8). Germans arrive for a month's work camp and adds strength to village beautification and Training Center construction in Mezio. Landlord returns for vacation, arranges House contract for following year and gives roofless, doorless, windowless building for Training Center grand possibility. Portuguese Youth Training program brings preschools and youth programs to nine Montemero mountain villages twice a week. First mural in Mezio is completed on work day combining all forces present(4).

Internal: Paul's architect brother, Pieter, and colleague, Truus, arrive from Holland and Lee Ferguson from London en route to new assignment to add expertise and brute force to Training Center construction (8). Paul returns from Chicago as Ana Maria leaves for a month at Fatima. Two Dutch volunteers, Hugo and Oscar, from last year drop by, adding strength to work force at the right moment (4).

Contradiction: Having Training Center habitable and House moved in within one week while depending on voluntary labor to get the job done. Weaving multitude of languages, cultures, ages and lifestyles into one mighty force to catalyze program actuation. (Weeks 4-8)

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: Four P.D.L.'s are complete, four are scheduled with two more yet to be confirmed. Volunteer Service Programme proves successful to the extent that a tentative set up of sojourn training in Brussels and Rome is anticipated.

Internal: Joe Dixon returns as House completes internal life planning.

Contradiction: Symbolising and marking the arenas which are under control. (Week 13)*

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Mr Stephane Hessel, formerly of Ministry of Cooperation and now concerned with audio-visual communication in France, agrees to be on Global Advisory Board.

Internal: A good look at the Communications Manual which we received in June opens our eyes to possibilities. Reading Samuel Pizar's 'The Human Resource' helps us understand USSR-Europe-USA relations, points to commerce as key to detente, explodes an image of possibility by describing the riches of the continent of Antarctica (look at Peters' projection realizing that Antarctica does by treaty belong to all the

nations!), and insists that humanity's first priority is development of the human resource. Pizar is Polish-born, American citizen, international lawyer, living in Paris, closely associated with J-J Servan-Schreiber.

Contradiction: Designing new office space to communicate effectiveness and relevance to ourselves and all comers. (Week 7)

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: House welcomes Academy grads as they move out from Brussels to see some of Europe and share the story of their eight weeks. Amsterdam Region circuit to attend IERD Steering Committee meeting and regional team meeting starts dialogue over form of ICA when Order is no longer resident in Amsterdam. Project visitation circuit involves House and members of NSC in northern Frankfurt Region.(9) The globe came to the House as it hosted Kang Byang Hoon from Korea and one of Sapporo's English students, Mr. Itagaiki. IERD funding proposals took up the lion's share of the House's time.(6)

Internal: Unexpected plans of the city to use a part of the backyard force us to harvest some of our green tomatoes and pumpkins and to make relish and jelly and celebrate the abundance of the garden.(9) The training dynamic became real in the form of one more person to the Academy for a module of training, and Jorg Mayer completing his second week of sojourning in the House.(6)

Contradiction: Creating a way to focus our corporate mind on the coming year in the midst of diffused individual tasks. Allowing the story that 'We can't plan until after the Academy' to block significant action relative to self-support. (Weeks 6-9)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: Lady Peggy Lindsay's visit expands the IERD/NSC frame and context with 11 calls in two days covering all sectors. Last minute Academy enlistment calling elicits four participants.

Internal: Week is highlighted by celebrations as House participates in colleague's birthday party in Amsterdam and board chairman, Jan Joosten, hosts an end of year celebration at the House with a rijstafle while Roundtable is celebration of community as guests and House ground "networking" in their own lives.

Contradiction: Pouring the concrete for the next steps when the forms are not in place. (Week 11)

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: Divine Word Fathers approve USD 30,000 for India; workday gets hot water running again in the kitchen, deals with leaks and moves the office to permit more space for boarders; employment research is begun and Form III translation is initiated for Italy documentation (13). All members of the House arrive, beginning yearly and quarterly planning and a creative manual for House life. Two boarders move in and a third calls to request room.

Internal: Celebration marks the end of a "claiming our space" workday, with the year's first fire in the fireplace (13). Whole House goes out for a real Italian feast with Academy participant, Piero.

Contradiction: The year's launch is clear, but our feet are not yet off the ground, due to a lack of specific strategies and assignments. Attempting overwhelming schedule with very fragile operating structures. (Weeks 12,13)*

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Circuit to Graz results in renewed commitment to RDS with a new location more related to the rural, and three co-sponsors. Initial visits are made with project directors to start the project descriptions process. Form III is translated and ready to use. Training dates are set for Hungary for mid-October.

Internal: Joe Dixon and daughters are sent out after three days of sightseeing in Vienna capped by an evening at the Heuriger.

Contradiction: Getting training models in such form that NSC members can lead workshops for RDS with style and effectivity. (Week 13)*

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: Year of Order Council is initiated with Area Council, focused on planning HDTI which integrates traditional curriculum with ongoing program activity and expansion. Gandhi readings and film along with Eid Al Adha (Islam's celebration of Abrahams' sacrifice of son) were distinct markings.

Internal: House welcomes back Fardos Yusef and Patrick Crump from Academy and discontinuity in time for Council and Cairo celebration.

Contradiction: Designing and translating HDTI curriculum approval for Egyptian situation when not having full time bilingual faculty to assist with school. (Week 11)

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: Visit with Mme. Farley of Canadian Embassy brings us another installment of grant money, and enlists her help on IERD survey. We find more ways to do self-support through possible contracts with Golf Hotel and DHL International for English teaching.

Internal: House works together to clean the garden.

Contradiction: Finding a logistical way of starting the new quarter. (Week 12)*

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Project visitation team in Jos Region, sponsored by Plateau State Ministry of Rural Development, joins ICA to look at six projects for possible IERD documentation; the six members of the team represent four sectors.

Internal: House celebrates completion of 1981 ICA Finance Statement by Arthur Young, Osindero and Moret, and secures inkind commitment.

Contradiction: Daring to discern the long range collegial structure that builds and sustains the Movement while enmeshed in implementing IERD. (Week 10)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Mazda parts arrive after 12 month wait! Preschool Advisory Board responds to Local Business Construction Proposal. Development struggle continues with imbalance between working and in hand (12). Diamond of Zambia Preschool Advisory Board meets for the first time with 12 around the table. This is the first structural decision-making group in the cluster. Twenty follow-up visits to confirm RDS participation are completed and a second-hand windmill at one sixth the going price is located for clinic water supply (7/IV).

Internal: John Telford arrives and John Polluck leaves for the U.K. to continue his education after six months as a volunteer. Immigration meetings continue to acquire work permits (12). Collegium on the IERD as Ritual clarifies the purpose and intent of the event and two staff attend a cocktail party in Lusaka to make friends.

Contradiction: Waiting on other's decisions when our timeline calls for immediate action. Shifting the operating mindset from expecting year after year support to a catalyst self-sufficiency mindset. (Weeks 12,6qtr.IV)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Nairobi EEC delegation calls to inform us they are satisfied with the first year of the grant and are recommending approval of Year Two. NSC visit to Kibwezi Women's Group completes 20 visits in preparation for final selection of projects while team leaves on IERD trek to Zimbabwe and Malawi. Two Year Journey Lab enables 40 Kenyans to prepare themselves to be part of the global movement (13). NORAD grant is signed and we receive largest ever cheque (1,150,000 K.shillings), after three months of struggling and sweating. World Bank agrees to find an IERD delegation from the country of Malawi as the bank's best example of a successful national bottom-up rural development programme in Africa. Area leadership gathers for 10 days of reporting and planning the coming year as one dramatic, well orchestrated event (12). Site visits from F.P.I.A. Thika Office, Ministry of Health, The Integrated Rural Development officer, UNICEF (about Jiko usage), UNDP (about children), C.C.F. (about social philosophy) an Englishman studying slum schools in Kenya, an Australian studying slum clinic in Kenya, an Argentinian studying "The evolutionary potential of slum dwellers in Kenya" and the IERD site selection team gives the feel of operating all week at the level of three simultaneous site visits going on. School starts its third term with a dramatic drop to 415 students as 50 are accepted to attend the nearby villages as well as a refresher course for fourteen experienced Health Caretakers and the construction guild receives emergency training in building sisal cement water tanks. Of five probe committees plus one volunteer accountant work out cash flow projections for five guilds that show very tight situations for October, and November and a guaranteed disaster for December, the Kabiro residents committee decides that we will struggle through this Quarter together (11).

Internal: All afternoon of games, picnic and three birthday celebrations inject discontinuity in the midst of area planning (13). Time and space are turned upsidedown as 55 people gather with great celebration ending first week with skits on the National elections and the send out of John Telford to Zambia (12). Sam returns from management trek and leaves for Area Planning, while Nayaboti is sent out to Muvui on a new assignment, Neddy and Jeremiah go on discontinuity. Timothy goes to a soccer team camp leaving two people to keep the project moving (11).

Contradiction: Overcoming 'business as usual' mentality in order to welcome Panchayat visit, host Swedish Funding Mission and participate fully in Area Council. Holding everyone in their seats to give form to the year while so much is demanding our attention. Maintaining momentum as all of Kabiro residents joyfully plunge into the local parliamentary election and all other meetings are cancelled. (Weeks 11,12,13)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: This is a week of many site visits from Freedom from Hunger, introducing rabbit raising to the families doing intensive gardens; USAID, funding the breast feeding health training programme; and Barclays Bank, considering general funding of the New Village Movement. Six volunteer village health caretakers from Katina (1), Muslim (2), Kawangware (2) and Kamitha (1) all in Kawangware sub-location complete two months of intensive health training and are prepared to work with the Kabiro Clinic for 6 months to improve health training in their village. Kabiro staff participates in Ndimi Consult in Keranyaga District, location impact in Kigumo Division, Murang'aa District, and the New Skills Training School in Sevagram, India.

Internal: Hubert returns from India while Sam returns from Ndimi and leaves for Project Directors' meeting and Jeremiah returns from Kigumo and leaves for Kikera as all celebrate using the new gas cooker.

Contradiction: How to maintain the momentum of development when all meetings must be legally approved until after the elections on 26 Sept '83. (Week 8)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Every project is visited in five days by section team to hold missional conversations and deliver stipends. Global film is shown to Kitale Rotary to follow-up Saboti Cluster water proposal, all done by that auxiliary. Lugari Division (in Kakamega District) village meetings and Busia District village meetings are held in preparation for cluster consults and new project house sites.

Internal: "Blue shirts savings account" manoeuvre is victorious as whole Kalwani House receives tailor-made shirts and blouses and reflect on commitment involved in decision of buying own blue and wearing it.

Contradiction: Sustaining the corporate life in the Houses during year's end pause for area planning and national elections. (Week 11)

NAIROBI—THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: In the past week, we held a fantastic VLC in the division for three days with 50 people, a Locational Assembly in Kinyona with 20 people, and a Community Workday with 153 people cementing the collegium floor for community center.

Internal: The House hosted Larry Philbrook from Section C for VLC, sent Nelson Sayia to Gatuto for setting up the Week 7 Consult and Patrick Mbulu to hospital.

Contradiction: Operating out all programmes in the midst of conflict government meeting and limited House finances plus scarcity of water. (Week 5)

MOMBASA—THE KAMWELENI HOUSE

External: The Village Development Committee with the help of ICA staff submitted companies proposal documents to private sectors for the Nguluku community centre materials. The Government District Officer accepted the motivational ICA style in initiating methods on community total organization which resulted in upgrading the public road and came up with 16 K-M road repair.

Internal: The House welcomed two section great circuiters (John Kivuva and Larry Philbrook) during the week of stipends distribution. It was a great week of celebrating for staff interchange. The House sent Paul S. Kilouzo with his new decision of marrying Mary Kithuka to the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: How to reschedule Quarter I time line cautiously in light of leftover Weeks 9 & 10 activities. (Week 12)

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: Ashram celebrates India's 36th Independence Day with villagers on August 15th. On the same day we celebrate the cultural celebration, Saint Sawata Mali, which honours the establishment of the Mali Society. Tap water for future community centre was installed.

Internal: Council team arrives in Maliwada and starts preparation. House starts Ashram garden to supplement budget. D.P. Kolankar starts teaching practice in Deogiri High School to get his teaching certificate towards starting a class in Aurangabad next year.

Contradiction: Engaging ourselves and village leaders to prepare for Continental Council and cluster programme on time. (Week 8)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Completion of 10 village meetings in the Cluster sets the stage for an exciting HDA meeting with over 40 villagers and all four sectors present. Topics include bank loans re-activation of Ambar Charkha with the addition of a loom to produce cloth, formation of a cluster health guild, and legalizing the HDA so that it can establish a marketplace. Meeting dates are set for the first health guild meeting and the next HDA meeting to be held in Panvel (13). Elder from Chikhale village, only village leader outside of Maliwada returns from Village Leaders Conference in Maliwada standing tall. First village meeting in cluster is held and many others set as all 12 cluster villages are visited in preparation for HDA meeting. Annual Appeal is launched with 50R's in hand, 1501R's committed, 9500R's working, and 25m,000R's targeted (12). Following a week of getting almost all new troops situated in the ashram and quarter planning on Week 11, troops visit cluster villages and recruit for village leaders conference. Visits to government officials and key guardians reveals mutual anticipation for an exciting year. Annual Appeal strategy sessions with four guardians establishes confidence in reaching our bottom-line of 10,000R's (11).

Internal: Week of excitement with colleagues coming and going for PDL and Annual Appeal, return of the bicycle after three months in the repairshop, and a great HDA sparks wild family night of acrobatics on the top floor (kranti chowk) of the ashram, including the "elephant walk" introduced from the U.S. (13). Four hour "collegium" with guardian Vijay Lokhande, focused on past, present and future images of HDA, builds corporate resolve to release its full potential as the necessary structure for human development in the cluster and block (12). Creating our missional story and holding a workday in ashram that includes cleaning, renovating sleeping quarters, painting the collegium room and making improvements towards a demonstration kitchen, signals troop readiness (11).

Contradiction: Integrating the local task with Area strategies for effective action in each village. Creating solid plans that engages all the troops and puts us where we need to be at the end of Week 13 (12). How to do the intensive task in the cluster while positioning ourselves to do the extensive task of the block. (Week 11,13)*

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Two CYFs are held for 75 students in Deogaon Ashram School and 61 students in Vaitarna High School. Three Adivasi people are sent from cluster village, Chandrachi Meth, to Nasik for driving course. Three day cluster consult has 70 people participating.

Internal: Principal Mr. M. S. Gosavi of Byr College visits Vaviharsh Ashram and talks on NSS Camp. Ashram receives new paint and decor and internal life training begins for new staff.

Contradiction: Completing cluster documentation as soon as possible so that it can be shown to four-sector people. (Week 7)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: With the paperwork now complete, BAIF inspect the site of their second proposed percolation tank in Jawale. Villagers receive an unexpected call from the BDO who later accompanies BAIF's site visit. Rs1,000 from the S.S.S. organization are received to assist the cluster's health programme.

Internal: Cluster newsletters are printed for distribution. The EG at last have two new benches to suit their size and the House sends out Kevin Boivin to Fifth City after working in Jawale for one year and in India for four.

Contradiction: Completing our tasks effectively with time, money and transportation threatening to disrupt the programme. (Week 6)

PUNE—THE MAALE HOUSE

External: Forty farmers meet in Male for a 2-day programme on Labour Training. The C.Y.F. in Male village was attended by 65 boys and girls, and proved to be very effective for cluster work. Two teams are now working on Annual Appeal in Kolhapur, Sangli, and Miraj.

Internal: Construction of a good collegium room and good staff facilities highlight the week. Part of the facility is the toilets which will be completed in the next three days as one of the demonstration toilets in the Male Project. We also fixed the magan chula (stove) in the kitchen.

Contradiction: How to help people understand each other and work together. (Week 12)*

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: Buldard engineers submit building estimate and drinking water is repaired. B.A.I.F. advises Budhoda village people about future planning. Shivaji holds birthday fair and Budhoda village people participate. New information about Ambar Charkha industries land arrives as Budhoda builds Ambedkar statue.

Internal: House has celebration with Area Team member Ambaji Kamble.

Contradiction: None submitted (week 5)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: We receive the check for 12,000R's from Bank of India for RDS Nagpur and collect the 156R's from Wanselka for VLC travel to Maliwada.

Internal: We send out Mr. B.B. Maske for VLC Maliwada, celebrate the birthday of Ku-Rakha Varma and send Mr. K. Dhabhade to Sevagram on new assignment.

Contradiction: How to enable new and old staff for four-sector from Quarter I into the Quarter II in midst of transition. (Week 11)*

NAGPUR—THE TEMBHURWAHI HOUSE

External: Ben Chapman arrives for 4-sector visit and introduces J.P. Shrivrastra to several people in Chandrapur. We continue to engage the local movement in the missional task through followup on the village electricity. The Bhedoda village women are ready for M/M/registration, having collected the money needed.

Internal: House made a demonstration kitchen with five food group picture, stand for keeping equipment and food cooking on the stove at beginning of a new year. House welcomes to G/Takare, P. Dhewan and Ben Chapman and sends out B. Chapman to his new assignment in Maliwada HDP with a good breakfast.

Contradiction: Finding a new Quarter II Tembhurwahi Cluster picture and creating a rhythm in Internal and External life for the new year. (Week 12)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: Preschool shed is built in Jambron and Medhda holds shramdan and meeting with Gram Sevak. Managing Director of Village Bank in Pradhpur adopts six cluster villages.

Internal: Wood is obtained for Ashram repairs, S. Sawarkhed arrives from Sevagram and Prasad family is sent out on discontinuity. Marathi classes start.

Contradiction: Setting up Global Women's Forums without any educated women on the staff. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Cluster activities gain momentum as first economic survey is completed toward Canara Bank loans with interviews of 20 households (75%) in signal Bijapur Village. Sorohi Village Health Camp inoculated 96 children. Kot the 4th of five cluster villages, opens Women's Centre with new sewing machine and nine paid registrations. Cluster 6-month report booklet is off the press and delivered to sponsors netting Rs. 6000. Annual Appeal has 50% bottomline in hand and the rest committed with a week to go.

Internal: Saturday workday transforms House while plans are laid for building new roof-top collegium to hold 50. Study collegium on Summer '83 sets stage for Year of Order Council work. E.G. curriculum is drafted and Saturday English classes in-house begin with fervour.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the week to assure that the foundational pillars to the Quarter stand. (Week 13)*

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Director of Agriculture Extension, Government of India, flies from New Delhi to participate in the entire Madras Rural Development Symposium, and comments on the effectiveness of ICA methods in bringing a diverse group together to share their experiences. Madras RDS (sixth in a series of RDS in southern India), is an outstanding success with strong participation throughout by the four sectors; the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Tamil Nadu, the Secretary of Agriculture Tamil Nadu, an ex-member of the Planning Commission, The President of South India Chambers of Commerce and Industry, and the Chairman of the Centre for Rural Development, Indian Institute of Technology all participate and speak during the inauguration. This RDS was set up by the mutual efforts of one local voluntary agency, one prestigious university, three chambers of commerce and the ICA. Eighty-six people participated in the Symposium.

Internal: Annual Appeal and Project Description Laboratory teams join forces with local troops from the Area and are immediately dispersed across the Area.

Contradiction: Coordinating the variety of demands that breaklooses in the cluster work, IERD and Development have placed upon us. (Week 12)*

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal campaign receives first contributions and releases Rs50,000 from Tisco as part of Rs. one Lakh donation. Contracts are awarded to bustee industries by Lipton. Area Council creates images for year and plans Quarter II (12). Moving to the new house becomes major focus of the week and Annual Appeal is initiated with use of new office downtown (11).

Internal: Area Council closed with a fantastic celebration highlight with E.G. dance, dart tournament and mixed fried rice (12). Tahir Ahmed, bustee guild member visits and invites all to his house for Muslim Sd-Ul-Zoha celebration (11).

Contradiction: Uncrystallised support systems. Enabling brooding for whole year in midst of getting on top of current external situation and setting up new internal systems. (Weeks 11,12)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Preparation and set up is already underway on RDIW's in seven locations continues to gather momentum as three teams depart for Malang (Oct. 20), for Palembang (Oct. 13), and for Muntiang (Oct. 24).

Internal: Tuekes' depart for Continental Council in Hong Kong, and Rich MacKay arrives from Brussels. House Emerging Generation has swim party at the International School. House readies itself for three new arrivals.

Contradiction: How to adequately context people arriving when everything is going full tilt. (Week 11)

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Sumatra is on the move with two local steering committees for two scheduled RDS's with 100 invitations sent and Rp. 250,000 raised. ICA meets new Sub-District Head (5th in five years) and pauses to re-route maneuvers to sweep him off his feet (12). Two set-up treks for RDS launches local IERD activities while they get us back into the region after at least seven months of intensified work in one province (11).

Internal: Romanus returns from Academy and travels in Europe with stories of the Pope and rural Europe. House gets a face lift inside and out with yearly whitewash and varnish touchups (12). People are in and out of the House on discontinuity and RDS set-up treks. Midweek English class over dinner proves Raharjo to be our resident grammar expert in Indonesian (11).

Contradiction: Focusing the year of the Council before everybody scatters across the nation for Area IERD maneuver. Maintaining Kecamatan activities with changing officials while assuring self-support strategy before we launch IERD activities. (Weeks 11,12)*

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: A visit to Penang Metro puts us in touch with potential colleagues.

Internal: House hosts Romanus Wau on his way back from Academy to Medan.

Contradiction: Keeping our eyes and ears open for strategic openings while continuing the mundane operations that keep us in being. (Week 12)*

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: The second harvest of rice make villagers of Bontoa very busy, since at about 50 Ha, it is largest second rice planting in Bontoa history that the farmers could remember. RDS set up is on schedule, and to be held on October 24 in Ujung Pandang in cooperation with University of Hasanuddin. Visit to government offices gives new idea as to who will be responsible for the continuation of Bontoa Project when the staff moves out.

Internal: Collegium on Saemaul Undong makes everyone more interested in village development. The House has one day discontinuity to celebrate Lebaran Hajji, attends four wedding celebrations in the village which brings possibility to Bruhan Zam who will marry next week.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on RDS and "hand-over" project while having difficulties getting to see government officers. (Weeks 11,12)*

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: The sixth NSC documentation is completed with San Rafael project agency, the Ministry of Agrarian Reform. Two more documentations are set up and dates finalised for Sept/Oct. China Banking Corporation decides to support the ICA once again with a financial donation(13). House sends Jesse Navarrete and Trisha Mueller plus two people from A.M.S.E.F. for NSC documentation in Imugian, Santa Fe. Final three documentation treks dates are set. In-kind letter is created and ready for delivery Week 1. Total raised P26,000. AMSEF volunteers complete brochure for Manila House for volunteers/sojourners and interns(12).

Internal: House swirls with celebrations and guests. Ben and Sita Potot arrive in the House for a few weeks from Sudtonggan. Charlie Banlaw, and Nelvie are received at House Church officially as non-residential sojourners. Four technicians arrive from AMSEF for House Church bringing the total up to 14. House experiences being on the other side of the computer with the movie "IRON". Saturday workday sees transformation in bodega (walk in storage space) office and outside yard(13). Long talked about bookshelf is finally purchased and library with file cards is created. AMSEF volunteers begin translation of journal quotes. The whole House watches the global film on human development and celebrates at Shakey's with rock and role music (12).

Contradiction: Creating established supporting systems making Manila House into a training and interchange coordinating centre. Setting out on the journey knowing final destination, but unsure of stops and general direction on the way there. (Weeks 13,1)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Proposal for year-long training program for Time Inc., Asia, is created and submitted.

Internal: House has party to celebrate Jack's 39th birthday.

Contradiction: Locating the gas to power our IERD Implementation Vehicle. (Week 4)

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Roxana, Rebecca, and Jennifer show the Hai Ou slide show and discuss the ICA at a Women's Interaction Group meeting. Peter obtains a 50% discount on 1,000 ICA envelopes from the printer. Bill and Jim confirm advisory board and steering committee attendance at their luncheon and prepare materials for that meeting.

Internal: House participates in the celebrative season by eating Mid-Autumn Moon Festival cakes and sending Roxana to the annual rehearsal of the memorial service for Confucius.

Contradiction: Experimenting with ways to be detached from pressing tasks to allow new perspectives and relationships to form. (Week 12)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Barangay Primary Health Care Committee meeting was held; ornamental plants seedlings were received from The National Power Corporation (NPC) watershed and distributed to the community. The dressed chicken price increase was approved and 96 dressed chickens which were delivered to Supply Oil Field Service had a total price of P1,384.25 for the 79 kilos.

Internal: The House "Bowling" celebration was held in Settlers, and a once-a-week game tournament of scrabble and the game of the general initiated. The week was highlighted by the Roundtable study with the materials which came from Chicago.

Contradiction: Processing the legal papers for PHDP turnover, while we are in the arena of filming the project for the purpose of radiating Tiwi Municipality for the next Quarter. (Week 13)*

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: An intensive week of preparation results in ink of copy health forms. Clinic workday sets up space for Delusom Pre-clinic and the opening of preschool building. During the Delusom Pre-clinic six doctors, one dentist and ten nurses, all volunteers, see more than 500 patients (12). One of the Mactan-24 ELNC teachers has married and a ELNC teacher begins working in Barangay Malinging and in Ibabao Agus. Sudtonggan Rope Craft II is doing well and three big buyers are located for the Rock Industry product. Ampalaya (bitter melon) is harvested (4). Rock was delivered to Manila and all the rock workers take a field trip to Sudtonggan. Community Assembly is held with the induction of the newly elected officers of the Sudtonggan Human Development Project. Goodyear Company renovated the playground of the Sudtonggan Primary School and preschool. We celebrate the first harvest of the fourth cropping of the ampalaya plants (3).

Internal: Three foreign staff have a visayan class. Anne Townley returns from Manila for LENS and Nening Ramirez returns from Davao (12). University students visit Sudtonggan Training Center. New Cebu House Park Area is made of rock and House studied eight parts of speech. E.G. joined the morning ritual or the daily office (4). Peace Corps group visit Sudtonggan and new House structures and quarter planning are completed and the waiting shed in Training Center is relocated and renovated (3).

Contradiction: Sense of urgency outweighs time for strategy. Looking upward to look for the sunshine and escaping from the muddy hole while circuiting on the social program on the Mactan-24. Researching food commodities sources for Mactan-24 ELNC's to serve the malnourished children. (Weeks 3,4,12)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

External: MSSD distribute the third batch of rice to drought victims. Monthly baby weighing is completed and reported this quarter. Mr Cesar Gante donates lumber for Langub preschool building. Highlight of the year is the 5th Anniversary Fair for LHDP and Mountain Cluster Project, attended by the Ministry of Health, POPCOM, MSSD, BPI, MEC and two international staff from Manila and 200 people from the cluster.

Internal: Cluster workers participate in house painting and repair and extending road to the highway.

Contradiction: Beginning the think-tank for next year's work and developing proposals for different agencies to support the program. (Week ?)

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

Internal: The Japanese Foreign Ministry decides to send one delegate from their Ministry to the IERD. Toeimachi calls to schedule a second T.M. after the first T.M. solved the community's water problem. Hong Kong Nexus stays after Area Council to set up 21 development calls and write proposals (9). Area Council gathers in Hiuo City for eight days in which reconfiguration and four year strategy are major themes. All members of Japanese Houses, colleagues, Nexus and Seoul representatives give in-put to new decisions. ICA Board of Directors meet to hear reports of Chicago and Area Council, update on Japan IERD, and reflect on reconfiguration. A positive and responsive support for the year (8).

Internal: 1982 Academy Grad Takako Kowamura announces her decision to intern in the Tokyo House. First step of reconfigurations send out Pattersons to Osaka House with a sushi party (9). Celebration of life's journeys with Paul Patterson's 8 birthday and David and Joyce Reese's 32nd anniversary (8).

Contradiction: Drawn out reconfiguration schedule delays Tokyo regional planning and implementation. Moving rapidly but with great strategic care to cover new configuration. (Weeks 9&8)

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Work continues on IERD village selection and funding. A key funding visit was made to Chung Buk Province to meet the head of Home Affairs, Mrs. Lee Sung Woo.

Internal: The returning trio from Brussels, Park Yong Chul, Min Sung and Han Kyung Ae pass on their way home.

Contradiction: Pulling together all the people and pieces to organize a great Regional Council next week. (Week 9)

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: The team visits the provincial office for a greeting and strong relationship. The House is invited in Nang-Sung sub-county sports day in which the Cheong Won Cluster is involved. The team is researching the travel expense of South-Asia site-visit that villagers are planning.

Internal: The House builds a new and fresh Internal Life design according to new quarter and sends an interview form of geo-socio-cultural analysis in Korea to Seoul House.

Contradiction: Putting starting blocks in place to release a fast start into the new quarter. (Week 12)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

Sato attends a planning meeting for an Oct. 22nd Village Movement Symposium where we will do a presentation of ICA work. Internal: The Patterson family is welcomed by the nieghbourhood at a reception where 24 young folk and adults gathered immediately followed by the regional team party with over 40 present. Mrs. Yashikaiwa was our delightful hostess for the evening.

Contradiction: Affirming the local history and unique people of the region while recognizing the need of the local is a global identity. (Week 12)*

External: Endorsements for volunteer symposium include Hokkaido newspaper, Hokkaido Board of Education, and local foundations. Meeting room and printing are inkinded. The Regional Team meets three times concerning new Japan House reconfiguration.

Internal: Manami Kitamura returns from Academy with great excitement and concern for training of second language speakers. Karen Ellsworth, Maxine and Teresa Butcher are sent out to new assignments. Alexander Tonosaki symbolizes end of his covenant with the Order at Sunday celebration.

Contradiction: Building our polity to meet the needs of transition times. (Week 11)

AREA SYDNEY

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: Philips Lighting rings to request LENS appointment for another division. Mount Isa Mines gives tentative date for Queensland LENS. Department of Primary Industry (Queensland) rings to set up two Rural Development Symposiums. Internal: House sends out Margaret Piper and is visited by Suzanne Heilman.

Contradiction: Accelerating structural relationships between Murrin Bridge and Lake Cargellig. (Week 12)*

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Representatives from Sydney and Murrin Bridge Houses join us for IERD check signals meeting and plan trek to Alice Springs, N.S.A. meeting and National Laugh Gola event. Ten signal communities have returned data forms for IERD participation.

Internal: Eight E. G. and the Newkirk family go camping in the mountains during V.J.L., highlights being Scavenger Hunt and ice cream feast. Barry and Margaret celebrate completed life of mother Nita Claire Oakley age 93 yrs. She was a pioneer, active in the three great waves of history.

Contradiction: Figuring out what we can do for council rather than what the council can do for us. (Week 6)

AREA SUVA

APIA - THE NUKU'ALOFA HOUSE

External: Colleen and Mike Chapman, a guardian from Australia went for a village visit with Sister Tu'ifua of the Women's Group Project during their inspection days. A Tongan kava party was done by the regional team as a means of fundraising for the coming Ha'apai PTS on January 1984 (1). Regional Team, ICA Advisory Board representatives, and colleagues celebrate at weekly Roundtable the receiving of \$300 pa'anga from Tonga Rotary Club for the Ha'apai Training School, launch fund raising activities with the writing and sendout of invitations to Kava Party and send out Lisiate 'Ikani Fifita to London, U.K. for two years of advanced study of teaching English as a second language. External: The team sets up nine Annual Appeal events around California during Week 13 to win the bottom-line in both cash-in-hand and pledges. We receive three calls asking for fall programs and volunteering for India. Site visits during Annual Appeal circuits reveals great excitement with IERD.

Internal: September self-support in hand and October/November support assured through new contract won by Computer Paradigm and two sojourners arriving.

Contradiction: Quarter II program, IERD activity and Year of Order Council mechanisms swirl all over and around California requiring a sharp focus into specific implementation. (Week 13)*

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: The Annual Appeal launched with assistance of Kevin Boivin and Lin Wisman from the Nexus, gets off to quick start with eight pledges totalling \$6,230. Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum when region is in summer mode. (Week 1)

THE VANCOUVER HOUSE

AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: Regional Team experiences the power of corporately searching for "our" training center, especially when the "perfect" possibility is uncovered. Visit to Prairie View A&M stimulates interest in participatory methods within the college. Metro meeting refreshes with dialogue on responsibility for broadening contexts.

Internal: Collegium on Kenya replication sparks reflections on life demand in North American front. House celebrates with laser light concert and ice cream sundaes.

Contradiction: Keeping the continuity of mission going in the midst of shifting personnel. (Week 2)

THE DALLAS HOUSE

External: First of four sessions is prepared in response to request from Texas Instruments for us to do training using their content and our method. United Methodist reporter hires Bill Bailey as permanent manager of promotion. Visits continue with colleagues of the spirit movement in North Texas.

Internal: The House sends Sharon Heiges out to her new assignment in Madrid

Contradiction: Integrating the implications of the Year of Order Council with our local mission. (Week 10)

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE External: The Lorimor team comes down for Annual Appeal wrap-up and Regional PSU. The House is now the proud owner of a Kay-Pro computer to be used for self-support and House. The Metro decides to hold evening House Churches twice a month (1). Kansas City House hosts two video events with Kansas City friends (13).

Internal: Life is highlighted by the celebration of Annual Appeal picnic in which both Houses participate along with two Chicago representatives. Marie Sharp leads a series of collegiums on Phase I while she is here (1). The youth are busy with an abundance of work, promising a good year with respect to self-support.

Contradiction: Spreading leadership of House to expand external mission. Maintaining ongoing corporate schedule to mesh with eventful time design. (Weeks 13, 1qtr2)*

LORIMOR HDP

External: The House team attends the Waterloo E. LENS follow up meeting and finds that a coordinating body and regular continuing meetings are established, as well as commitment to attend LENS facilitators training in Kansas City. The Annual Appeal Campaign ends with a picnic celebration in Kansas City sending Don Raschke and Marie Sharp back to Chicago. The Annual Appeal films allow many new contacts to participate in the work of the ICA, provide a new tool for continuing development and pull all we are doing in doing one thing.

Annual Appeal is launched in grand style as regional team gathers for film kickoff event and works through strategy, story and names of people to be called, pitched, visited and invited to events.(11) Management by Mission training for the Governor's Job Training Office enters its fourth session as government employees wrestle with "your situation is never your problem" amidst changing structures, crises, and political maneuvers. Regional team is addressed by new responsibility for development and management of corporate ICA funds at great Continental Council.(10)

Internal: Lynde Lachman is sent out to return to school in Oregon and Justin Morrill arrives with stories and plans for Annual Appeal victories.(11) Region's Lake Woebegone, Minnesota skit takes third place at Council while youth cluster, Kitt Farrar and Burce Ellsworth, maintain 16 hour days engaging seven courses each in advanced high school program.(10)

Contradiction: Seeing the victory of the Annual Appeal - with doubled bottom lines on number of people and amounts pledged - versus finding ourselves in the midst of a protracted campaign. Pouring everything into Annual Appeal while taking full advantage of all the opportunities it opens up for IERD, marketing, and strategy. (Weeks 10,11)

THE DETROIT HOUSE

External: Three thousand four hundred and twenty dollars is in hand for the Annual Appeal with \$16,432 pledged, \$200 in the mail and \$7,000 in proposals(12). Fourteen at regional team meeting launched Annual Appeal. Advertising firm of Walter Thompson contributes V.H.S.(11).

Internal: A new 40" T.V., three free lifetime memberships with the Video Club, and the introduction to a low cost dental care plan are inked(12). Thirty-eight people celebrated completed life of Atsumo (Artie) Matsuoka at Memorial House Church (11).

Contradiction: Breaking loose colleagues to a deepened sense of responsibilities for time and financial support. Developing new systems and approaches that work for Annual Appeal and regional release. (Weeks 11,12)

THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: Visit to RDS project wins big YES to hosting five-county Showcase Forum with visions of launching a replication zone. Mid-North Indianapolis Partnership hold fourth 90-day Celebration and Planning event at Butler University with major emphasis on building and broadcasting the story of this urban HDZ. Participation in Hiroshima Day vigil lays groundwork for "Inter-Movement Think Tank". Private companies and public agencies volunteer technical services, printing, and professional practicum training for the new Mid-North Home Holps, Inc., now in its fourth week of preparing "welfare" mothers for employment in human service ventures. Kingsley/IERD video premiered in Indiana at the Debra Drown send-out to her new India assignment, in Kentucky at the Appalachia RDS Steering Committee session, and in Ohio at the Cincinnati Metro Council. Department of Local Government, State of Kentucky, contracted with ICA to facilitate a one day program where mayors and county judges met to design their own training program. Warren, Indiana (RDS community) agrees to host 10 county symposium.

Internal: Fifty guests crowd into the Gary and Pat Drown home to send out Debra to new India assignment. House attends State Fair and local cabaret. House launches new edge in symbolic life with adapted "YES" ritual for even weeks and a set of Daily Readings for odd weeks. New House decor rationale and new internal life design mark shift in consciousness to Year of Order Council.

Contradiction: Gathering momentum for a new leap across the region and figuring out where we are going to land. (Weeks 5-7)

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: Employment Task Force launches year's plan for increasing jobs in Loisaida with a day-long meeting attended by 34 people representing all four sectors. Annual Appeal gets off to a good start with four fund-raising events hosted by regional colleagues. All day Saturday training prepares six citizens of Rockaway, NJ to be team leaders in upcoming community LENS.

Internal: A series of collegiums establishes internal patterns and time designs for the year.

Contradiction: Keeping the home fires burning in the midst of massive program and development efforts. (Week 11)

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: Dorcas Rose and Rick Jones lead Calvary United Methodist Church in Vestal planning meeting in the midst of Annual Appeal visits. Albany colleagues gather at Brainards for a viewing of the Kingsley tape. Week is full of phone calls for Annual Appeal visits.

Internal: A colleague's VCR in the House makes it possible for a Friday night at the movies double feature.

Contradiction: Finding the rest of the Annual Appeal bottom line when all the old faithfuls have already pledged. (Week 12)*

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: Secretary of Transportation, Republican Elizabeth Dole and her husband Republican Senator Dole agree to be listed on the invitation as supporters of the October 27th IERD benefit, giving us an exciting balance to our otherwise heavily Democratic list of endorsers. Team from House facilitates another planning event for Lutheran Churches focussing on Ministry to a pluralistic society. Annual Appeal circuits in D.C., Richmond, Petersburg, Charleston and Pittsburgh result in \$27,000 out of \$38,000 pledged (12). A team from House participates in Youth Retreat of Hereford Maryland United Methodist Church group. Hunger Project says yes to \$5000 grant for IERD and local task force meets to continue implementation of October IERD benefit (10).

Internal: Number of renters expands to eight, further stabilizing our self-support base through the hostelry program. Randell White begins after-school job at \$4.50/hour (12). Eight Lutheran seminarians move into House as renters for this semester. Larry Ward and Marcia Knight report on part II of Continental Council (10).

Contradiction: Being so busy with momentum of last year that stopping the world to decide Quarter II seems out of the question. Putting corporate power into our financial structures. (Weeks 10,12)

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal contacts are the focus of the Week and Youth, John Powell and Abednego Barnes, participate in Annual Appeal visit to the Robinson family in Andover. Strategy session with Terry McKenna, V.P. at John Hancock Insurance results in a 30-day maneuver plan for corporate involvement in Training, Inc (12). The fifth Annual Student Leadership Conference was held at Northfield-Mount Hermon School in Western Mass. (where LiLin Hilliard and Tina Slicker are attending High School) with 55 attending. Eleven workshop leaders included three high school students and five college students. The event was videotaped to be made available for similar workshops. The Training, Inc. of Boston heed a board meeting with old South church announcing an additional \$20,000 contribution. Plans were set for an October maneuver to raise \$50,000 from the private sector for Training, Inc. of Boston (11). Entire House participates in Continental Council followed by Regional Team planning to ground the implications. Excellent meeting at Lt. Governor's office results in model to deal with Public Sector funding needed for Boston Training Inc. (10).

Internal: The Betamax purchased to show Kingsley provides House celebration with four movies during Week II. Repairs to collegium room windows provide a better outlook!(12) Collegium reports are action-filled with John Powell's report of one year in Kenya, Abednego Barnes report of one year in Peru, and Joy Wu's report on Academy in Brussels. The Bengels celebrate 10 years of marriage (11). School starts sending Kendra McCleskey to Mt. Holyoke College, Debra Griffin to Boston University, John Powell and Abednego Barnes to Cathedral High, Alison Bengel to 3rd grade and Joana Bengel to preschool (10).

Contradiction: Caring for the future of the Order by designing the local components of the Panchayat visit. Being able to pick up \$175,000 already committed for Training, Inc. Boston by securing additional \$100,000 in 60 days. Visioning beyond bottom lines to long range images centered on addressing social contradictions. (Week 10,11,12)

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: First October workday at the Cornshop concentrates on heat for fall-wood, duct & furnace completion. Starks Enterprises Corp. holds membership meeting to discuss potentially devious tupil (green sale for store), gets through amicably (no sale). Largest Annual Appeal donor in state doubles pledge (13). Annual Appeal first day in Portland produces four out of four yeses. Starks Enterprises Corporation meets to discuss plans for a new store, possibly on sec owned green. Tim and Wendy help facilitate Department of Human Services workshop promoting cooperation among professionals dealing with alcohol, drug abuse and mental health (12).

Internal: House enjoys first workday (cookout by stream) celebration along with sec workeers and five from Boston (13). Tim begins weekend school in New Hampshire towards masters in community development. Wendy helps with common ground fair; Jim wins doubles tennis tournament for 2nd year in a row.

Contradiction: Clarifying real "Year of Order Council" issues prior to Panchayat visit to adequately participate in dialogue. Enabling long-range perspective that facilitates wise decisions now. (Weeks 12,13)*

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal ends with victory of \$3,500 in hand and \$42,330 pledged for the rest of the year (\$2,330 over our bottom line). The largest pledge increase of 250% is credited to the impact of the videos. Quarter planning begins with the regional team working out the vision for the next six months (13). NSC selects 12 projects to represent Canada at the IERD, including three projects in Ontario. Key event was handing out the book describing nearly 100 documented projects. The NSC members made new decisions to offer their time, talents, and money to do whatever is necessary to make the IERD a success. The Kingsley video continues to impact people by creating a mood of hope. A long-time Native Community Branch staff member reports that he had never seen natives and whites working together like at the Orillia RDS (12).

Internal: The House celebrates Jan Sander's birthday following the last video showing of the month (13). The House continues to be sustained by the great stories from Annual Appeal calls (12).

Contradiction: Trying to operate on all cylinders without having pinned down the time design for the quarter. Not having the systems in place to ensure follow-up of the Annual Appeal and finding the rest of the "A" money to fund the regional program. (Week 12,13)*

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: Second Annual Appeal video evening results in cheques in hand, and three future events planned for educational networks. Phoning and letters to Maritimes bring \$2,000 plus commitments. Habitation Jeanne Mance puts another structure in place "Vial of Life" - medical alert experiment and attendance at fund raising dance for "Centre de Depamage" (community aid post) gives another entrée into Montreal community.

Internal: House receives gift of Canadian "Case Studies" collegium revealing potential for real & practical community exchange. A newly tiled kitchen floor and two inherited cabinets enhance our space.

Contradiction: Putting more concrete form over Continent, Area, Region, and linkages. (Week 13)*

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Area Council is held in Conacaste. Strategic picture for 83-84 involves seven thrusts. Area works through next phase of Conacaste Expansion together. Region Mexico City year calendar is finished during Week II.

Internal: Bill Slicker arrives and puts on strategic hat out of his experience in Latin America.

Contradiction: Getting Mexico mission and House structures started when Guatemala is demanding full time. (Week 11)

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: Project Extension is symbolically inaugurated, with unexpected announcement by the primary school director at the Monte Grane independence day celebration of the new preschool "resulting from the extension of the Conacaste Project." Third preschool is opened in Aguasaldobregas 10km from Conacaste. Project friend and professional film-maker visits and tapes one hour of interviews for a fund-raising film, allows the team to experience new creativity in our supporters as they look for new ways to enable development in these tight economic times.

Internal: Guatemala and Mexico staffs come together for the first time this year and experienced the diversity of Mexico and Central America through reports, conversations and broodings on the task of caring for the whole area.

Contradiction: Transmitting images and operating style of the extension mode "to team and community over against the tendency toward "business as usual" style. (Week 11)

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External: Following HDTI graduation of 60 village leaders, implementation treks are held in Portland and St. Andrew in 10 villages with 28 meetings creating 2 year tactical timelines. Blue Mountain Yallah's Valley Cluster treks are begun with Rotary volunteers. IDB and NCB make 3 site visits to Woburn Lawn with full page ad in Gleaner on Woburn Lawn loan programme. Mary and Alice are welcomed back from Nairobi GRA. Presentation is made to 5 Methodist Churches. Lecture given to Cornell University graduate students at UWI. Princeton student and Peace Corps volunteers visit Woburn Lawn.(12-6) The Woburn Lawn Economix Development Cooperative Society Ltd. holds its Annual General Meeting and 3rd anniversary with officials from IDB, NCB and Co-op Dept. giving their praises. Alice Wright is re-elected as Chairman. Rotary International volunteer, Paul Crouch, who is Chairman of the Brother's Brother Foundation and former Managing Director of ALCOA in Jamaica, presents tools and books to the H.E.A.R.T. Trust and Library Service who present them to the Woburn Lawn Project through the Kingston Rotary Club. Pre Co-op meetings are held in the Blue Mtn. Cluster and 2 year tactical timelines are built in Yallah's Valley Cluster.(7)

Internal: House sends out Denison Pierre to Dominica and welcomes Rob and Nadine from the Global Council and Benjamin from the 6th grade rite of passage. House welcomes Bill and Dan Bingham on visit, holds celebration sending out a Dutch and an English volunteer and has first total House meeting in six weeks.

Contradiction: Filling full the practical implications of a replication strategy which pushes in new directions into unknown territory and sustaining, expanding and deepening the movement. (Weeks 12-7)

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: House created and began to implement an in-depth research model for the Provincial structures and Andean-Indian culture in preparation for the Continental GRA in Caracas. Printed new National Program Brochure. To expand the bee industry we inked more wood to build thirty new hive. Azpitia women's industry is organized with local director and coordinator (11). Materials purchased for women's handwork industry and women in Azpitia and other cluster community (San Luis) are practicing to begin work on actual products September 19. Market secured for products produced by November 15. House started a log book of events held in new training center - over 750 people have participated in events since June 1983. Twenty volunteers are working weekly with NSC now on project selection and funding schemes (10).

Internal: New internal structures for teams, external task sections and commissions calls forth people to play multiple roles. Celebrated the arrival of the Black family at an Azpitia theatre presentation of an Incan myth (11). Workdays are held plastering new dormitory rooms to prepare for new assigned staff and interns. Celebrated the arrival of new Canadian volunteer Mike Arnoni. Weekly Order Days are an address on old hands as well as new interns as we articulate past wisdom and push images for the future (10).

Contradiction: Remembering to launch the necessary bold moves while your plate is already full of interesting and significant things. Securing program funding rapidly to enable more time to do the program. (Weeks 10,11)*

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: Fourth Human Development Laboratory finishes with 32 graduates. Urban Development Symposium (UDS) trains 80 in Foro Comunitario and generates invitations for program from across the city (13). Training of 40 representatives from Caracas Community Centro in forum method in preparation for upcoming Urban Development Symposium (UDS) of all community centros (12).

Internal: Celebration of Juan José's 21st birthday provides relaxation (13). Ralph Davila comes by for a day of highly creative planning for the Latin American November Research Assembly and Priorship Training School (12).

Contradiction: Getting November GRA, Council and Priorship School done before it just happens. Finalizing November designs with minimum global input available and some uncertainty regarding audience. (Weeks 12,13)*

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: Rural Development Symposium is held in Santiago. Fifty persons in attendance, 15 projects presented, and all four sectors dialogue over successes and failures of Rural Development and future steps to consider. The conclusion was an interest to continue the dialogue on Rural Development in Chile. (13) Loan for Panaderia turns into glorious gift and work begins immediately on expansion. Offer comes to do LENS all over country but big draw back is our reluctance to let go to a total Chilean staff. Dr. Brogoño, Vice President of the Executive Committee of the World Health Organization offers the opportunity for Ana Mari Urrutia (GAB member) to attend the Latin American Council in Caracas (12).

Internal: Eight thousand dollars is committed by colleagues in the States to help purchase new House and enable self support and expansion of a Latin American team (13). House rejoices at the decision of a new family of four to begin sojourning as soon as we move into our bigger House.

Contradiction: Planning a fantastic Panchayat visit without having to lose our momentum for the other tasks needed. Moving through the fog of the many arenas of ambiguity into new clarity on what we stated as our task for the year. (Weeks 12,13)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: In three weeks development brings in about \$1900 including \$280 raised in Rio Bonito for purchase of a 16mm film projector. Community Centre Inauguration in Bracana (after 8 months of construction) is highlighted by speeches by several residents, ribbon cutting by the prefect and the sale of new community T-shirts. NSC meets to set-up sub-committees for fund-raising, project selection and publicity. Farmers in Bracana and Tatus hold the first meeting of the Bracana/Tatus Farmer's Association and elect officers. The team visited the new mayor in Rio Bonito who asks for a closer relationship in the future. Project selection committee studies and categorizes 20 IERD project summaries and decides to send form 2 to 12. The Bracana and Mata community clusters formalize their consensus of the year's directions by moving ahead on implementation. Rio Bonito office continues building linkages between ICA and municipal structures. The first community interchange takes place when four men from the Mata community have lunch at the House before spending an afternoon in Bracana visiting houses, chatting with producers and principally looking around the community centre. Money raised on the ICA stall at the inauguration was used this week to fit glass in all the centre's windows. IERD keeps on schedule with forms 1&2 translated and ready to post to eleven possible projects, plus progress reports sent to UNDP and UNICEF.

Internal: House uses Roundtable to study the 82-83 Kenya report.

Contradiction: Involving the existing structures without destroying community momentum. (Weeks 4-9)

GLOBAL NEXUS

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: Designed Quarter II circuitry and launched to "Magnificent 7" circuitry system with five circuits to six regions. Mailing for one Service Venture client, one new contract, and one new hostelry, signal new breakthroughs in self-support. Two projects say yes to representing Belgium at the International Exposition Plenary.

Internal: Brussels Nexus received Cynthia Margarite Cook and Denise Elaine Stanley as interns for 1983-1984 following a corporate conversation on the Intern Ritual.

Contradiction: Burgeoning opportunities for sojourners and volunteer training exceeding readiness of models to respond, symbolises possibilities of things to come. (Week 13)*

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: A Rural Development Symposium in Bangalore sponsored by the Canara Bank brings together 17 volunteer agencies and seven banks.

Internal: Seven people from the Nexus join 3000 in celebrating the marriage of Asaram Rokhade and Mangla More in Athwad, a former district project village. A bluesari, a journal and centerpiece gifts are given to symbolize their decision to be in the ICA. Nexus Order Day and fasting day with key reflection create a week of celebration of life.

Contradiction: Complexity in orchestrating year end demands tends to blur images of riding momentum. (Weeks 9)

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: Participation in Area Councils within the continent is preceded by extended collegiums on Priorities, Memorials, Nexus Experiment and Finances. We celebrated with Area Suva their receipt of the first scholarship for the next Pacific Training School. IERD visits continue in Hong Kong with presentations to Raj Yoga group and social services network which will culminate in a symposium next month. Linda is sent out to her assignment on New Delhi, having raised \$1125 towards her travel.

Internal: The image of creative dancing House sees in 'Flashdance' is very appropriate as Nexus enters this new year of experiment and the Telfords are sent out to their new assignment. Visitors come and stay for a meal: Daljit Singh from Tata Company, India spins us the exciting story of his company's social development and thrills the youth when he reveals himself to be an International Cricketer.

Contradiction: Ensuring the appropriate containers for the vintage wine of this year of Nexus experiment. (Weeks 7-9)

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: Meeting with Control Data Corporation in Minneapolis produces structure of data base for the IERD document. Donation of \$10,000 toward Order Council is received from colleague on top of \$50,000 Annual Appeal pledge symbolizing forthcoming support for the Year of Order Council.

Internal: First in a series of 44 house study constructs symbolizes seriousness relative to the Year of Order Council as we begin our new bi-weekly time design alternating task force work with study and research.

Contradiction: Massive vision of the Year of Order Council, particularly for the next quarter, is not captured in visible structures nor practical implementaries. (Week 12)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that May month is closed at Rs. 65,325 in Bombay. TISCO commits Rs. 100,000 for June; and manoeuvre debriefing is highlighted by activation of regionalising IERD with Rs. 20,000 in hand for Banagalore RDS advertising brochure. The key contradiction lies in the arena of having June/July global assignments drain the momentum established towards July 31st. (Week 9)

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that an IERD Project numbering system was created and holds two guild nights one on Centrum space and one on the USA NSC meeting. Ten LENS International appointments are held and Image Enterprises is set up. Helen Haug gets a new contract job (full-time) with the graphics division of a Chicago firm. The key contradiction lies in the arena of in the midst of the orchestration of the preparation for next week's events ensuring the consideration of the situation we really have and the spirit depth which is needed. Week 13)*

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that for the IERD taskforce - this was the week to deepen the involvement of the Indian Steering Committee in the preparation phase of the IERD. In Bangalore RDS, Mr. B. Rudramoorthy participates actively not only in the process of the event but representing the IERD to the people gathered as well as to the whole public answering burning questions. In the same week Mr. Bhoopat Trivedi asks to be on the ISC but really offers to hold an RDS in Jamnagar for more local level in Gujrat. The breakthrough is experienced in the arena of RDS set up for which there are materials, guidelines and methods created and sent out to the Houses. The futuric contradiction for the IERD taskforce for the coming week 10 is limited utilisation of resources available to ensure the comprehensiveness of the IERD. (Week 9)

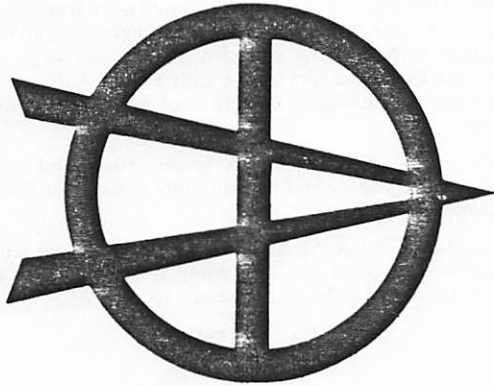
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Ten NSC members are visited and Week I meeting is set to select Spanish projects for India. Ministry of Labour contact is re-visited and gives further leads on IERD and ICA funding (13). Self-support is put into a seeable winning position as free schooling & uniforms are secured for the Armas children. House familiarizes itself with the regional file system and gets on top of the local turf through a series of collegiums and two outings, one a walking tour of old Madrid, the other a visit to the Prado Museum. House is cleaned and decorated in time to move into Week II Quarter planning (12).

Internal: Jim Campbell arrives from Brussels and aids in Week II quarter planning sessions which give direction and "wheels" to planned actions. Regional Council is a time for planning and reflection with House & Academy grads. GAB member shares good reports he has heard about progress of IERD from other GAB members and we move into the year with four appointments set.

Contradiction: Configuring the troops to march into the battle on all fronts. Anticipating requirements for self-support and IERD prep in light of the very real time demands. (Weeks 12,13)

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Misereor grant comes in for another year, and John Scully from the EEC calls saying there is money available for ICA: Portugal proposal, Training Centre construction continues finishing the floors, ceiling and windows.

Internal: House gathers back for the first time after Continental Council and discontinuity and receives warm welcome of villagers and inkind gifts of potatoes, vegetables and a storeroom. A diesel Peugeot is bought, giving us wheels once more. Quarterly planning is done interspersed with construction; Branca Ramalho is sent out to her village of Bigorne after one and a half years of living in ICA House.

Contradiction: Completely finishing with House/Training Centre construction to launch us out the door and into the new year. (Week 2)*

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: Four P.D.L.'s are complete, four are scheduled with two more yet to be confirmed. Volunteer Service Programme proves successful to the extent that a tentative set up of sojourn training in Brussels and Rome is anticipated.

Internal: Joe Dixon returns as House completes internal life planning.

Contradiction: Symbolising and marking the arenas which are under control. (Week 13)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Mr Stephane Hessel, formerly of Ministry of Cooperation and now concerned with audio-visual communication in France, agrees to be on Global Advisory Board.

Internal: A good look at the Communications Manual which we received in June opens our eyes to possibilities. Reading Samuel Pizar's 'The Human Resource' helps us understand USSR-Europe-USA relations, points to commerce as key to detente, explodes an image of possibility by describing the riches of the continent of Antarctica (look at Peters' projection realizing that Antarctica does by treaty belong to all the nations!), and insists that humanity's first priority is development of the human resource. Pizar is Polish-born, American citizen, international lawyer, living in Paris, closely associated with J-J Servan-Schreiber.

Contradiction: Designing new office space to communicate effectiveness and relevance to ourselves and all comers. (Week 7)

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: House welcomes Academy grads as they move out from Brussels to see some of Europe and share the story of their eight weeks. Amsterdam Region circuit to attend IERD Steering Committee meeting and regional team meeting starts dialogue over form of ICA when Order is no longer resident in Amsterdam. Project visitation circuit involves House and members of NSC in northern Frankfurt Region.(9) The globe came to the House as it hosted Kang Byang Hoon from Korea and one of Sapporo's English students, Mr. Itagaiki. IERD funding proposals took up the lion's share of the House's time.(6)

Internal: Unexpected plans of the city to use a part of the backyard force us to harvest some of our green tomatoes and pumpkins and to make relish and jelly and celebrate the abundance of the garden.(9) The training dynamic became real in the form of one more person to the Academy for a module of training, and Jorg Mayer completing his second week of sojourning in the House.(6)

Contradiction: Creating a way to focus our corporate mind on the coming year in the midst of diffused individual tasks. Allowing the story that 'We can't plan until after the Academy' to block significant action relative to self-support. (Weeks 6-9)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: Lady Peggy Lindsay's visit expands the IERD/NSC frame and context with 11 calls in two days covering all sectors. Last minute Academy enlistment calling elicits four participants.

Internal: Week is highlighted by celebrations as House participates in colleague's birthday party in Amsterdam and board chairman, Jan Joosten, hosts an end of year celebration at the House with a rijstafel while Roundtable is celebration of community as guests and House ground "networking" in their own lives.

Contradiction: Pouring the concrete for the next steps when the forms are not in place. (Week 11)

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: A visit with the General Council of the Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother indicates both involvement in our Year of Order Council and a potential contribution of \$5,000 for India. Contact is re-established with Rome's Methodist Minister and the activities of his congregation.

Internal: News of four volunteers arriving in November from England motivates efforts for house repairs. All available rooms are filled with boarders, new typing job and English student are secured.

Contradiction: Practical necessities draw off cash and energy from the task. (Week 1)*

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Executive Committee of National Steering Committee meets to discuss funding sources. Letter is written to be mailed to companies for funding seeking to break open private sector support. Two training sessions for workshop leaders for the Symposium are held with Hannerl Golda.

Internal: Christel Otke is sent out after sojourning for three weeks.

Contradiction: Finding ways to use NSC member strength to advantage when meeting at one time and in one place seems impossible. (Week 1)*

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: Year of Order Council is initiated with Area Council, focused on planning HDTI which integrates traditional curriculum with ongoing program activity and expansion. Gandhi readings and film along with Eid Al Adha (Islam's celebration of Abrahams' sacrifice of son) were distinct markings.

Internal: House welcomes back Fardos Yusef and Patrick Crump from Academy and discontinuity in time for Council and Cairo celebration.

Contradiction: Designing and translating HDTI curriculum approval for Egyptian situation when not having full time bilingual faculty to assist with school. (Week 11)

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: Visit with Mme. Farley of Canadian Embassy brings us another installment of grant money, and enlists her help on IERD survey. We find more ways to do self-support through possible contracts with Golf Hotel and DHL International for English teaching.

Internal: House works together to clean the garden.

Contradiction: Finding a logistical way of starting the new quarter. (Week 12)

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Project visitation team in Jos Region, sponsored by Plateau State Ministry of Rural Development, joins ICA to look at six projects for possible IERD documentation; the six members of the team represent four sectors.

Internal: House celebrates completion of 1981 ICA Finance Statement by Arthur Young, Osindero and Moret, and secures inkind commitment.

Contradiction: Daring to discern the long range collegial structure that builds and sustains the Movement while enmeshed in implementing IERD. (Week 10)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Two hundred and sixty of the quarterly newsletters are printed and mailed. One hundred and twenty-five mothers and infants are seen at the monthly clinic where a local medical teaching hospital donates time and medicines. Eighteen NSC meeting invitations are hand delivered.

Internal: A new resolve to tighten up House life is actualized with a detailed menu and budget, and the initiation of a weekly budget review to figure out how to operate with no money.

Contradiction: Enabling the NSC and the Kapini Community Development Association to face the implications of being responsible for programme deadlines. (Week 13)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: The great week of the Council includes the Lab receiving 35 new interns, an Order Day commission of 31 new Fellows in the Order and Area Council highlighted by the Panchayat spending eight hours with the 139 gathered representatives envisioning the next 16 years to launch the Year of the Order Council and the Year of the Village Leaders. Mission from Swedish Co-operative Center begins three week visit to design next stage of work with ICA in Kenya. Health programmes intensify with Lion's Club health camp in Kabiro and participation in National Community based health care conference.

Internal: New village movement welcomes Shakuntala Coothaparonmaul from Mauritius Labor Council who will be trained by us for one year. Resurgence Research begins with visits to the National Museum of Kenya and great traditional tribal dancing at Area Council.

Contradiction: Launching the practics for Quarter II of Area Support that allows the Year of the Council, the Year of the Village Leaders and the IERD to be one event. (Week 1)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: This is a week of many site visits from Freedom from Hunger, introducing rabbit raising to the families doing intensive gardens; USAID, funding the breast feeding health training programme; and Barclays Bank, considering general funding of the New Village Movement. Six volunteer village health caretakers from Katjina (1), Muslim (2), Kawangware (2) and Kamitha (1) all in Kawangware sub-location complete two months of intensive health training and are prepared to work with the Kabiro Clinic for 6 months to improve health training in their village. Kabiro staff participates in Ndimi Consult in Keranyaga District, location impact in Kigumo Division, Murang'aa District, and the New Skills Training School in Sevagram, India.

Internal: Hubert returns from India while Sam returns from Ndimi and leaves for Project Directors' meeting and Jeremiah returns from Kigumo and leaves for Kikera as all celebrate using the new gas cooker.

Contradiction: How to maintain the momentum of development when all meetings must be legally approved until after the elections on 26 Sept '83. (Week 8)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Every project is visited in five days by section team to hold missional conversations and deliver stipends. Global film is shown to Kitale Rotary to follow-up Saboti Cluster water proposal, all done by that auxilairy. Lugari Division (in Kakamega District) village meetings and Busia District village meetings are held in preparation for cluster consults and new project house sites.

Internal: "Blue shirts savings account" manoeuvre is victorious as whole Kalwani House receives tailor-made shirts and blouses and reflect on commitment involved in decision of buying own blue and wearing it.

Contradiction: Sustaining the corporate life in the Houses during year's end pause for area planning and national elections. (Week 11)

NAIROBI—THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: In the past week, we held a fantastic VLC in the division for three days with 50 people, a Locational Assembly in Kinyona with 20 people, and a Community Workday with 153 people cementing the collegium floor for community center.

Internal: The House hosted Larry Philbrook from Section C for VLC, sent Nelson Sayia to Gatuto for setting up the Week 7 Consult and Patrick Mbulu to hospital.

Contradiction: Operating out all programes in the midst of conflict government meeting and limited House finances plus scarcity of water. (Week 5)

MOMBASA—THE KAMWELENI HOUSE

External: The Village Development Committee with the help of ICA staff submitted companies proposal documents to private sectors for the Nguluku community centre materials. The Government District Officer accepted the motivational ICA style in intiating methods on community total organization which resulted in upgrading the public road and came up with 16 K-M road repair.

Internal: The House welcomed two section great circuiters (John Kivuva and Larry Philbrook) during the week of stipends distribution. It was a great week of celebrating for staff interchange. The House sent Paul S. Kilouzu with his new decision of marrying Mary Kithuka to the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: How to reschedule Quarter I time line cautiously in light of leftover Weeks 9 & 10 activities. (Week 12)

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: Ashram celebrates India's 36th Independence Day with villagers on August 15th. On the same day we celebrate the cultural celebration, Saint Sawata Mali, which honours the establishment of the Mali Society. Tap water for future community centre was installed.

Internal: Council team arrives in Maliwada and starts preparation. House starts Ashram garden to supplement budget. D.P. Kolankar starts teaching practice in Deogiri High School to get his teaching certificate towards starting a class in Aurangabad next year.

Contradiction: Engaging ourselves and village leaders to prepare for Continental Council and cluster programme on time. (Week 8)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Completion of 10 village meetings in the Cluster sets the stage for an exciting HDA meeting with over 40 villagers and all four sectors present. Topics include bank loans re-activation of Ambar Charkha with the addition of a loom to produce cloth, formation of a cluster health guild, and legalizing the HDA so that it can establish a marketplace. Meeting dates are set for the first health guild meeting and the next HDA meeting to be held in Panvel (13). Elder from Chikhale village, only village leader outside of Maliwada returns from Village Leaders Conference in Maliwada standing tall. First village meeting in cluster is held and many others set as all 12 cluster villages are visitd in preparation for HDA meeting. Annual Appeal is launched with 50R's in hand, 1501R's committed, 9500R's working, and 25m,000R's targeted (12). Following a week of getting almost all new troops situated in the ashram and quarter planning on Week II, troops visit cluster villages and recruit for village leaders conference. Visits to government officials and key guardians reveals mutual anticipation for an exciting year. Annual Appeal strategy sessions with four guardians establishes confidence in reaching our bottom-line of 10,000R's (11).

Internal: Week of excitement with colleagues coming and going for PDL and Annual Appeal, return of the bicycle after three months in the repairshop, and a great HDA sparks wild family night of acrobatics on the top floor (kranti chowk) of the ashram, including the "elephant walk" introduced from the U.S. (13). Four hour "collegium" with guardian Vijay Lokhande, focused on past, present and future images of HDA, builds corporate resolve to release its full potential as the necessary structure for human development in the cluster and block (12). Creating our missional story and holding a workday in ashram that includes cleaning, renovating sleeping quarters, painting the collegium room and making improvements towards a demonstration kitchen, signals troop readiness (11).

Contradiction: Integrating the local task with Area strategies for effective action in each village. Creating solid plans that engages all the troops and puts us where we need to be at the end of Week 13 (12). How to do the intensive task in the cluster while positioning ourselves to do the extensive task of the block. (Week 11,13)

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Two CYFs are held for 75 students in Deogaon Ashram School and 61 students in Vaitarna High School. Three Adivasi people are sent from cluster village, Chandrachi Meth, to Nasik for driving course. Three day cluster consult has 70 people participating.

Internal: Principal Mr. M. S. Gosavi of Byr College visits Vaviharsh Ashram and talks on NSS Camp. Ashram receives new paint and decor and internal life training begins for new staff.

Contradiction: Completing cluster documentation as soon as possible so that it can be shown to four-sector people. (Week 7)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: With the paperwork now complete, BAIF inspect the site of their second proposed percolation tank in Jawale. Villagers receive an unexpected call from the BDO who later accompanies BAIF's site visit. Rs1,000 from the S.S.S. organization are received to assist the cluster's health programme.

Internal: Cluster newsletters are printed for distribution. The EG at last have two new benches to suit their size and the House sends out Kevin Boivin to Fifth City after working in Jawale for one year and in India for four.

Contradiction: Completing our tasks effectively with time, money and transportation threatening to disrupt the programme. (Week 6)

PUNE—THE MAALE HOUSE

External: Forty farmers meet in Male for a 2-day programme on Labour Training. The C.Y.F. in Male village was attended by 65 boys and girls, and proved to be very effective for cluster work. Two teams are now working on Annual Appeal in Kolhapur, Sangli, and Miraj.

Internal: Construction of a good collegium room and good staff facilities highlight the week. Part of the facility is the toilets which will be completed in the next three days as one of the demonstration toilets in the Male Project. We also fixed the magan chula (stove) in the kitchen.

Contradiction: How to help people understand each other and work together. (Week 12)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: Buldard engineers submit building estimate and drinking water is repaired. B.A.I.F. advises Budhoda village people about future planning. Shivaji holds birthday fair and Budhoda village people participate. New information about Ambar Charkha industries land arrives as Budhoda builds Ambedkar statue.

Internal: House has celebration with Area Team member Ambaji Kamble.

Contradiction: None submitted (week 5)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: Collector of Wardha district comes to community centre to inaugurate "Wine Shop Week" and celebrate Gandhi's 114th birthday. District Superintendent of Police distributes Rangoli and Kabadi prizes. Prohibition Department showed "Keewan" movie. Cluster preschool teachers gather for next plan. Youth module does Grand Shramadham and a cluster circuit and fixes date for economic module with D.R.D.A.

Internal: Hingamghatwala Shophupr who has given money for Maliwada VLC as did Surekha Thakker, a Mahrati movie actor visits the House.

Contradiction: How to engage all the shops when we don't have coming Quarter plan. (Week 13)*

NAGPUR—THE TEMBHURWAHI HOUSE

External: Two villages submitted proposal to MSEB. Also a bakery proposal to Chandrapur. Two hundred and fifty villages come together for the Mahatma Gandhi Birthday program (13). We visited Anandran project in Varora Taluka for PDL set up, also Chandrapur and Ballusha for introduction with new ICA people. Two villages from Tembhurwahi Clusters are ready to do Mahila Mandel registration (12).

Internal: We repair the motorcycle and do Shramdan in the Nehru garden (13). New staff arrivals in the Tembhurwahi Ashram and new decor in the Collegium room (12).

Contradiction: Unclear about the Quarter's rhythm leads to discontinuous rhythm about internal and external task. (Weeks 13,12)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: Preschool shed is built in Jambron and Medhda holds shramdan and meeting with Gram Sevak. Managing Director of Village Bank in Pradhpur adopts six cluster villages.

Internal: Wood is obtained for Ashram repairs, S. Sawarkhed arrives from Sevagram and Prasad family is sent out on discontinuity. Marathi classes start.

Contradiction: Setting up Global Women's Forums without any educated women on the staff. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Cluster activities gain momentum as first economic survey is completed toward Canara Bank loans with interviews of 20 households (75%) in signal Bijapur Village. Sorohi Village Health Camp inoculated 96 children. Kot the 4th of five cluster villages, opens Women's Centre with new sewing machine and nine paid registrations. Cluster 6-month report booklet is off the press and delivered to sponsors netting Rs. 6000. Annual Appeal has 50% bottomline in hand and the rest committed with a week to go.

Internal: Saturday workday transforms House while plans are laid for building new roof-top collegium to hold 50. Study collegium on Summer '83 sets stage for Year of Order Council work. E.G. curriculum is drafted and Saturday English classes in-house begin with fervour.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the week to assure that the foundational pillars to the Quarter stand. (Week 13)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Director of Agriculture Extension, Government of India, flies from New Delhi to participate in the entire Madras Rural Development Symposium, and comments on the effectiveness of ICA methods in bringing a diverse group together to share their experiences. Madras RDS (sixth in a series of RDS in southern India), is an outstanding success with strong participation throughout by the four sectors; the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Tamil Nadu, the Secretary of Agriculture Tamil Nadu, an ex-member of the Planning Commission, The President of South India Chambers of Commerce and Industry, and the Chairman of the Centre for Rural Development, Indian Institute of Technology all participate and speak during the inauguration. This RDS was set up by the mutual efforts of one local voluntary agency, one prestigious university, three chambers of commerce and the ICA. Eighty-six people participated in the Symposium.

Internal: Annual Appeal and Project Description Laboratory teams join forces with local troops from the Area and are immediately dispersed across the Area.

Contradiction: Coordinating the variety of demands that breaklooses in the cluster work, IERD and Development have placed upon us. (Week 12)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal brings in Rs50,000. PDL's mailing is completed with one confirmation with the Nimpith ashram of Ramakrishna Missions. Meetings with new secretary of United Social Welfare Centre and Bustee Local Committee propels bustee programme planning forward.

Internal: Use of new office at Tata Centre creates more effective communications dynamic serving all programme arenas. YOC day during State Bundh (Strike) allows for reflection and model building for Quarter YOC structures.

Contradiction: Launching maneuvers on many fronts with minimal set up. (Week 13)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Preparation and set up is already underway on RDIW's in seven locations continues to gather momentum as three teams depart for Malang (Oct. 20), for Palembang (Oct. 13), and for Muntlang (Oct. 24).

Internal: Tuekes' depart for Continental Council in Hong Kong, and Rich MacKay arrives from Brussels. House Emerging Generation has swim party at the International School. House readies itself for three new arrivals.

Contradiction: How to adequately context people arriving when everything is going full tilt. (Week 11)

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Sumatra is on the move with two local steering committees for two scheduled RDS's with 100 invitations sent and Rp. 250,000 raised. ICA meets new Sub-District Head (5th in five years) and pauses to re-route maneuvers to sweep him off his feet (12). Two set-up treks for RDS launches local IERD activities while they get us back into the region after at least seven months of intensified work in one province (11).

Internal: Romanus returns from Academy and travels in Europe with stories of the Pope and rural Europe. House gets a face lift inside and out with yearly whitewash and varnish touchups (12). People are in and out of the House on discontinuity and RDS set-up treks. Midweek English class over dinner proves Raharjo to be our resident grammar expert in Indonesian (11).

Contradiction: Focusing the year of the Council before everybody scatters across the nation for Area IERD maneuver. Maintaining Kecamatan activities with changing officials while assuring self-support strategy before we launch IERD activities. (Weeks 11,12)

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: Final draft of 1982-1983 Annual Report cum newsletter is completed and model is built for producing it at a minimal cost.

Internal: S. Krishnan is sent out to Indonesia for several weeks for enabling the campaign of RDS.

Contradiction: Allowing a breakloose of creativity in transforming our space with images for the next year and getting it all finished within a week with the staff left in the House. (Week)*

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: The second harvest of rice make villagers of Bontoa very busy, since at about 50 Ha, it is largest second rice planting in Bontoa history that the farmers could remember. RDS set up is on schedule, and to be held on October 24 in Ujung Pandang in cooperation with University of Hasanuddin. Visit to government offices gives new idea as to who will be responsible for the continuation of Bontoa Project when the staff moves out.

Internal: Collegium on Saemaul Undong makes everyone more interested in village development. The House has one day discontinuity to celebrate Lebaran Hajji, attends four wedding celebrations in the village which brings possibility to Bruhan Zam who will marry next week.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on RDS and "hand-over" project while having difficulties getting to see government officers. (Weeks 11,12)

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: The sixth NSC documentation is completed with San Rafael project agency, the Ministry of Agra Rian Reform. Two more documentations are set up and dates finalised for Sept/Oct. China Banking Corporation decides to support the ICA once again with a financial donation(13). House sends Jesse Navarrete and Trisha Mueller plus two people from A.M.S.E.F. for NSC documentation in Imugian, Santa Fe. Final three documentation treks dates are set. In-kind letter is created and ready for delivery Week 1. Total raised P26,000. AMSEF volunteers complete brochure for Manila House for volunteers/sojourners and interns(12).

Internal: House swirls with celebrations and guests. Ben and Sita Potot arrive in the House for a few weeks from Sudtonggan. Charlie Banlaw, and Nelvie are received at House Church officially as non-residential sojourners. Four technicians arrive from AMSEF for House Church bringing the total up to 14. House experiences being on the other side of the computer with the movie "IRON". Saturday workday sees transformation in bodega (walk in storage space) office and outside yard(13). Long talked about bookshelf is finally purchased and library with file cards is created. AMSEF volunteers begin translation of journal quotes. The whole House watches the global film on human development and celebrates at Shakey's with rock and role music (12).

Contradiction: Creating established supporting systems making Manila House into a training and interchange coordinating centre. Setting out on the journey knowing final destination, but unsure of stops and general direction on the way there. (Weeks 13,1)

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Proposal for year-long training program for Time Inc., Asia, is created and submitted.

Internal: House has party to celebrate Jack's 39th birthday.

Contradiction: Locating the gas to power our IERD Implementation Vehicle. (Week 4)

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Roxana, Rebecca, and Jennifer show the Hai Ou slide show and discuss the ICA at a Women's Interaction Group meeting. Peter obtains a 50% discount on 1,000 ICA envelopes from the printer. Bill and Jim confirm advisory board and steering committee attendance at their luncheon and prepare materials for that meeting.

Internal: House participates in the celebrative season by eating Mid-Autumn Moon Festival cakes and sending Roxana to the annual rehearsal of the memorial service for Confucius.

Contradiction: Experimenting with ways to be detached from pressing tasks to allow new perspectives and relationships to form. (Week 12)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Informal session of ICA and auxiliary include dynamic exchange between MSSD local workers and the PCDW Provincial Community Development Workers.

Internal: House sends out Casquijo for one week discontinuity. House experiments with secular ritual. In the middle of the night a sneak thief carries off all clocks in House leaving Zambo team timelessly suspended in space.

Contradiction: The rocky road has become a mountain avalanche. The boulders that are striking our heads are labeled "Spend Little and "Get it Done". (Week)*

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: The House received medicines and clinical supplies from the Regional Health Office and the free-clinic in Barangay Bang-Bang. Island Meeting is held in Sudtonggan Training Center with the newly appointed ELNC teachers in the four villages in Mactan-24. The preschoolers received their identification card. Sudtonggan Craft workers, Craft No. 1 take a field trip. The eggplant, the white squash and ampalaya (bitter melon) are harvested.

Internal: New motor bike tire and water pump is fixed. University students visit Sudtonggan Training Center receiving a short briefing about the Human Development Project.

Contradiction: Keeping up the task in the midst of shortage of staff and exciting environment in preparation for the coming of the Panchayat. (Week 6)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

External: MSSD distribute the third batch of rice to drought victims. Monthly baby weighing is completed and reported this quarter. Mr Cesar Gante donates lumber for Langub preschool building. Highlight of the year is the 5th Anniversary Fair for LHDP and Mountain Cluster Project, attended by the Ministry of Health, POPCOM, MSSD, BPI, MEC and two international staff from Manila and 200 people from the cluster.

Internal: Cluster workers participate in house painting and repair and extending road to the highway.

Contradiction: Beginning the think-tank for next year's work and developing proposals for different agencies to support the program. (Week 1)

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

Internal: The Japanese Foreign Ministry decides to send one delegate from their Ministry to the IERD. Toeimachi calls to schedule a second T.M. after the first T.M. solved the community's water problem. Hong Kong Nexus stays after Area Council to set up 21 development calls and write proposals (9). Area Council gathers in Hiuo City for eight days in which reconfiguration and four year strategy are major themes. All members of Japanese Houses, colleagues, Nexus and Seoul representatives give in-put to new decisions. ICA Board of Directors meet to hear reports of Chicago and Area Council, update on Japan IERD, and reflect on reconfiguration. A positive and responsive support for the year (8).

Internal: 1982 Academy Grad Takako Kowamura announces her decision to intern in the Tokyo House. First step of reconfigurations send out Pattersons to Osaka House with a sushi party (9). Celebration of life's journies with Paul Patterson's 8 birthday and David and Joyce Reese's 32nd anniversary (8).

Contradiction: Drawn out reconfiguration schedule delays Tokyo regional planning and implementation. Moving rapidly but with great strategic care to cover new configuration. (Weeks 9&8)

THE SEOUL HOUSE

Contradiction: Figuring out what we can do for council rather than what the council can do for us. (Week 6)

AREA SUVA

APIA - THE NUKU'ALOFA HOUSE

External: Effective Supervision Course graduation event furthers contacts with the Industrial and Political community. Visits with Government officials following Rural Development Workshop underscores the need to continually recreate the story about impactful events. Regional Team concretizes curriculum and training design for Pacific Training School at Roundtable.

Internal: Visit with owner of the land, the training centre is on, at luncheon relieved uncertainty about future of House location.

Contradiction: Developing the spirit skills that enable people to articulate their vision and build models to move toward it in a culture that is longing for answers. (Week 3)*

Contradiction: Maintaining missional momentum when region is in summer mode. (Week 1)

AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: Su Clinica Familiar from Brownsville is chosen to represent the U.S. at the Delhi Plenary. Four families from Gujarat State are excited by Ben Kingsley film showing and offer to introduce us to the 25,000 Indians living in the Houston area. Annual Appeal goal is exceeded as total from New Orleans circuit are reported.

Internal: The Mazda collapses in Louisiana on Annual Appeal circuit and a pledger who happens to be a car dealer smooths the way for purchase of a nearly new fiery red Toyota.

Contradiction: Bracketing the unclarity over the quarter's priorities and timeline long enough to do what must be done this week. (Week 1)*

Lela Mosley returns from the Brussels Academy and Lily Fox goes to East Waterloo, Iowa to talk about the Fifth City Model to interested community people.

Internal: The House sends Sharon Heiges out to her new assignment in Madrid

Contradiction: Integrating the implications of the Year of Order Council with our local mission. (Week 10)

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE External: The Lorimor team comes down for Annual Appeal wrap-up and Regional PSU. The House is now the proud owner of a Kay-Pro computer to be used for self-support and House. The Metro decides to hold evening House Churches twice a month (1). Kansas City House hosts two video events with Kansas City friends (13).

Internal: Life is highlighted by the celebration of Annual Appeal picnic in which both Houses participate along with two Chicago representatives. Marie Sharp leads a series of collegiums on Phase I while she is here (1). The youth are busy with an abundance of work, promising a good year with respect to self-support.

Contradiction: Spreading leadership of House to expand external mission. Maintaining ongoing corporate schedule to mesh with eventful time design. (Weeks 13,1qtr2)

LORIMOR HDP

External: The House team attends the Waterloo E. LENS follow up meeting and finds that a coordinating body and regular continuing meetings are established, as well as commitment to attend LENS facilitators training in Kansas City. The Annual Appeal Campaign ends with a picnic celebration in Kansas City sending Don Raschke and Marie Sharp back to Chicago. The Annual Appeal films allow many new contacts to participate in the work of the ICA, provide a new tool for continuing development and pull all we are doing in doing one thing.

Internal: Egyptian Dinner with Marianist Order guests tops off a day of physical work and Order Forms collegium.

Contradiction: Keeping our context clear about the why and when of tactical implementation. (Week 2)*

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: Employment Task Force launches year's plan for increasing jobs in Loisaia with a day-long meeting attended by 34 people representing all four sectors. Annual Appeal gets off to a good start with four fund-raising events hosted by regional colleagues. All day Saturday training prepares six citizens of Rockaway, NJ to be team leaders in upcoming community LENS.

Internal: A series of collegiums establishes internal patterns and time designs for the year.

Contradiction: Keeping the home fires burning in the midst of massive program and development efforts. (Week 11)

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: The House transits from Annual Appeal to quarter programs. Appointments are scheduled for next week in Buffalo. The regional team musters to the Albany Metro to participate in the Panchayat Trek.

Internal: Temporary room reassignments and massive house cleaning are called for in order to host the Panchayat team.

Contradiction: Getting swift sponsorship for the Approaches That Work Conference. (Week 2)*

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: One thousand four hundred and seventy dollars in Annual Appeal money comes in this week—\$800 of it is a contribution from a Baltimore artist who donated the proceeds from her recent art sale. Invitations to the first IERD benefit are mailed, and first returns come in after two days with 20 people saying "yes" and \$385 in-hand. Program PSU produces a unifying symbol on the next 16 months as well as a plan for Quarter II. Private agencies in International Development (P.A.I.D.) call to remind us that we've missed recent meetings and they've missed us!

Internal: Quarter II House life manual is completed and experimental time design is implemented. Hostelry program receives request from Philadelphia Lutheran Seminary for housing for 15 people Nov. 6-11 during 500th birthday celebration of Martin Luther.

Contradiction: Making Order assignments which create the interface that releases people to do the tasks before us this quarter. (Week 1)*

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Reception for Panchayat and Area Priors at Women's City Club on Beacon Hill provides occasion for 24 Metro colleagues to enjoy Ben Kingsley, be introduced to the Year of Order Council and share their insights about where the future is breaking loose in Boston. Starks Workday No. 2 gives 10 people from Boston hands-on experience installing furnace ductwork and fireproof sheetrock.

Internal: Hosting the Panchayat and Area Priors is highlighted by "next 16 years" conversation, formation dialogue and dinner out where women and men go their separate ways for a very collegial experience.

Contradiction: Completing the Annual Appeal calls and creating the ongoing, practical system for keeping 60 days ahead on meeting our bottom lines. (Week 1)*

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: First October workday at the Cornshop concentrates on heat for fall-wood, duct & furnace completion. Starks Enterprises Corp. holds membership meeting to discuss potentially devious tupil (green sale for store), gets through amicably (no sale). Largest Annual Appeal donor in state doubles pledge (13). Annual Appeal first day in Portland produces four out of four yeses. Starks Enterprises Corporation meets to discuss plans for a new store, possibly on sec owned green. Tim and Wendy help facilitate Department of Human Services workshop promoting cooperation among professionals dealing with alcohol, drug abuse and mental health (12).

Internal: House enjoys first workday (cookout by stream) celebration along with sec workers and five from Boston (13). Tim begins weekend school in New Hampshire towards masters in community development. Wendy helps with common ground fair; Jim wins doubles tennis tournament for 2nd year in a row.

Contradiction: Clarifying real "Year of Order Council" issues prior to Panchayat visit to adequately participate in dialogue. Enabling long-range perspective that facilitates wise decisions now. (Weeks 12,13)

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: Region experiences a new breakloose as 20 people join the House to celebrate Thanksgiving dinner, and two people decide to become Day I volunteers. Four colleagues join in building the quarter programme calendar and research model. Project representatives let out whoops of joy when notified they are selected for India. A new age of relationships with religious orders begins as Lorne loan payback schedule is agreed upon and thousand of dollars of interest is forgiven.

Internal: House gets missional boost as the weekly time rhythm is finally consensed on and task teams are created.

Contradiction: Creating the context for effective engagement of volunteers. (Week 1)*

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: Second Annual Appeal video evening results in cheques in hand, and three future events planned for educational networks. Phoning and letters to Maritimes bring \$2,000 plus commitments. Habitation Jeanne Mance puts another structure in place "Vial of Life" - medical alert experiment and attendance at fund raising dance for "Centre de Depamage" (community aid post) gives another entrée into Montreal community.

Internal: House receives gift of Canadian "Case Studies" collegium revealing potential for real & practical community exchange. A newly tiled kitchen floor and two inherited cabinets enhance our space.

Contradiction: Putting more concrete form over Continent, Area, Region, and linkages. (Week 13)

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: National Steering Committee breakfast results in their decision to have pre-selection meeting next week to focus on documentation of all seven-plus projects presented at RDS. Sara Quintanilla offers her time and photo skills in upcoming documentation visits to 11 Mexican states. Dr. Enrique Dulanto, ICA President in Mexico, offers to accompany House on documentation visits. Visit to COPARMEX (union of local businesses) reveals another possible project bringing total to nine!

Internal: Panchayat visit catalyzes our colleagues in Mexico City and swirls Guatemala into a new phase. Area Council in Conacaste includes full day Order Day. Joe and Araceli Mathews assist House in two and a half day planning session which ends in creation of year's timeline and Quarter II focus & rhythm for four regions.

Contradiction: Getting 80% local participation in IERD. (Week 1)*

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: Project Extension is symbolically inaugurated, with unexpected announcement by the primary school director at the Monte Grane independence day celebration of the new preschool "resulting from the extension of the Conacaste Project." Third preschool is opened in Aguasaldobregas 10km from Conacaste. Project friend and professional film-maker visits and tapes one hour of interviews for a fund-raising film, allows the team to experience new creativity in our supporters as they look for new ways to enable development in these tight economic times.

Contradiction: Transmitting images and operating style of the extension mode "to team and community over against the tendency toward "business as usual" style. (Week 11)

External: Following HDTI graduation of 60 village leaders, implementation treks are held in Portland and St. Andrew in 10 villages with 28 meetings creating 2 year tactical timelines. Blue Mountain Yallah's Valley Cluster treks are begun with Rotary volunteers. IDB and NCB make 3 site visits to Woburn Lawn with full page ad in Gleaner on Woburn Lawn loan programme. Mary and Alice are welcomed back from Nairobi GRA. Presentation is made to 5 Methodist Churches. Lecture given to Cornell University graduate students at UWI. Princeton student and Peace Corps volunteers visit Woburn Lawn.(12-6) The Woburn Lawn Economix Development Cooperative Society Ltd. holds its Annual General Meeting and 3rd anniversary with officials from IDB, NCB and Co-op Dept. giving their praises. Alice Wright is re-elected as Chairman. Rotary International volunteer, Paul Crouch, who is Chairman of the Brother's Brother Foundation and former Managing Director of ALCOA in Jamaica, presents tools and books to the H.E.A.R.T. Trust and Library Service who present them to the Woburn Lawn Project through the Kingston Rotary Club. Pre Co-op meetings are held in the Blue Mtn. Cluster and 2 year tactical timelines are built in Yallah's Valley Cluster.(7)

Internal: House sends out Denison Pierre to Dominica and welcomes Rob and Nadine from the Global Council and Benjamin from the 6th grade rite of passage. House welcomes Bill and Dan Bingham on visit, holds celebration sending out a Dutch and an English volunteer and has first total House meeting in six weeks.

Contradiction: Filling full the practical implications of a replication strategy which pushes in new directions into unknown territory and sustaining, expanding and deepening the movement. (Weeks 12-7)

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: Week of planning scheduled a Foro Campaign to do 24 Foros in two provinces in the next two months at the same time a decision was made to send seven people to the Continental GRA Council and Priorship Training School in Caracas. Fourteen people from the cluster communities decided to be trained to lead the Foros to cover the staffing gap. Visited GAB member Mrs. Belaunde (first lady) with Panchayat and presented a proposal for IERD delegate funding which would have the ICA do programs in her urban "slum" projects. This is a new breakthrough in IERD funding - earning the money by doing programs.

Internal: Panchayat visit called forth a deeper understanding of the task of our Order in History and interns witnessed to their own significant role in this task.

Contradiction: Securing appropriate working office space in Lima to enable the expanding task. (Week 1)*

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: First money arrives towards purchase of ICA Office/House in Santiago! Sol de Septiembre elects new directiva with new seriousness and the Alcalde of Lampa attends meeting and comments on the unbelievable difference between Sol and the other communities in Lampa comuna.

Internal: Panchayat visit is great "empuje" for total region - collegiums enable visions to gel into corporate strategies - Thursday night reception raises new profound questions of impact for the IERD in Chile.

Contradiction: Finding ways to evaluate our missional decisions, honor everyone's timelines and still get our task done. (Week 1)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: In three weeks development brings in about \$1900 including \$280 raised in Rio Bonito for purchase of a 16mm film projector. Community Centre Inauguration in Bracana (after 8 months of construction) is highlighted by speeches by several residents, ribbon cutting by the prefect and the sale of new community T-shirts. NSC meets to set-up sub-committees for fund-raising, project selection and publicity. Farmers in Bracana and Tatus hold the first meeting of the Bracana/Tatus Farmer's Association and elect officers. The team visited the new mayor in Rio Bonito who asks for a closer relationship in the future. Project selection committee studies and categorizes 20 IERD project summaries and decides to send form 2 to 12. The Bracana and Mata community clusters formalize their consensus of the year's directions by moving ahead on implementation. Rio Bonito office continues building linkages between ICA and municipal structures. The first community interchange takes place when four men from the Mata community have lunch at the House before spending an afternoon in Bracana visiting houses, chatting with producers and principally looking around the community centre. Money raised on the ICA stall at the inauguration was used this week to fit glass in all the centre's windows. IERD keeps on schedule with forms 1&2 translated and ready to post to eleven possible projects, plus progress reports sent to UNDP and UNICEF.

Internal: House uses Roundtable to study the 82-83 Kenya report.

Contradiction: Involving the existing structures without destroying community momentum. (Weeks 4-9)

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: ICA International gets ready for IERD strategy check signals by extensive encourgaing of communications with all corners of the earth. Belgium IERD team confirms two delegates and chance for subtitling Kingsley IERD vido (French and English).

Internal: Service Ventures had 12 appointments, mailing jobs for 2,000 and setting 20 for next week with support of troop from Madrid and enabled further equipment of training Center with help of 12 truck loads of former Brussels House/Nexus facility.

Contradiction: Developing the strategy for responding to the total picture of the new emerging zonal situation. (Week 1)*

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal is fast approaching its bottomline with record gift of Rs25,000. This Week II PDL training happens in Bangalore and Bombay in preparation for a month of doing PDLs. Eight hundred and twenty-three participants in 13 RDSs' representing 393 organizations (1). House hosts Sir James Lindsay at dinner during his week of Bombay IERD Development calls and hears an update report on the IERD. New volunteer, Julian Woods, arrives (12).

Internal: House welcomes new volunteer, Vanessa Smith, from England and Barbara Hawley from Global Management Centrum. House fills up as Annual Appeal teams and PDL set-up teams return (1). Collegium on geo-social continent of North America expands global images of House. Firday evening dinner conversation on the victories of the day, 130,000Rs received by development, prompts a spontaneous ice-cream celebration (12).

Contradiction: Trying to protect ourselves from the intrusions of new arenas of demand. Finding new ways to get our priorities done in the light of seemingly competitive deathground bottomlines. (Weeks 1,12)*

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: Participation in Area Councils within the continent is preceded by extended collegiums on Priorities, Memorials, Nexus Experiment and Finances. We celebrated with Area Suva their receipt of the first scholarship for the next Pacific Training School. IERD visits continue in Hong Kong with presentations to Raj Yoga group and social services network which will culminate in a symposium next month. Linda is sent out to her assignment on New Delhi, having raised \$1125 towards her travel.

Internal: The image of creative dancing House sees in 'Flashdance' is very appropriate as Nexus enters this new year of experiment and the Telfords are sent out to their new assignment. Visitors come and stay for a meal: Daljit Singh from Tata Company, India spins us the exciting story of his company's social development and thrills the youth when he reveals himself to be an International Cricketer.

Contradiction: Ensuring the appropriate containers for the vintage wine of this year of Nexus experiment.(Weeks 7-9)

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: LENS International team makes presentations to two prospective clients and ignites sparks of hope for their organizations. Fourteen of the 20 projects selected for US participation in the India IERD plenary have said yes, UNICEF sends \$19,500 to Brussels, seven PDL's have been scheduled, and word was received from Brussels that the size of the US delegation has been expanded. A \$500 check is received from a previously unknown donor as a result of his receipt of the direct mail campaign solicitation letter.

Internal: The Nexus House, Chicago Area House and guests are deeply addressed by the memorial service celebrating the completed life of Wesley Dana Salmon and the celebrative breakfast and conversation following. As the Chicago teachers' strike grinds on into its third week, the Phase I staff seizes the opportunity to catalyze engagement of the emerging generation in a massive recycling effort, a hunger walk that raises \$250 for the Food Depository and a series of Student House service projects. The first of the Week II training tracks series was launched, reaffirming the gift of the Guild configuration experiment and producing a talking paper on religious order rules.

Contradiction: Unformulated winning strategies for fiscal and space management. (Week 3)*

PDL Command Post decor is up and Operating Systems operational. PDL training in three sites across the continent. The key contradiction lies in the arena of The NSC is experienced as disjointed from undergirding the PDL. (Week 1)*

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that this week is spent planning for Quarter II out of the context of the year's tasks and working on our space design to sustain us through the year. Conversation with WCDS Indian coordinator James Brown clarifies ICA and WCDS positions and expectations regarding volunteers as well as letter sent to London House. The key contradiction lies in the arena of focusing on individual tasks and reporting rather than corporately deciding priorities. (Week 1)*

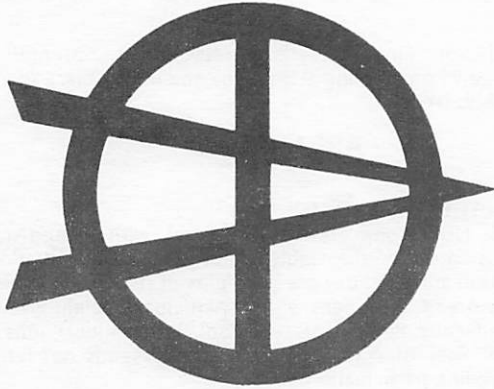

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: NSC selects eight projects for PDL's in preparation for final project selection. Two NSC members come to House for three hour meeting to prepare first major government funding request for both ICA and IERD. Media workshops and development workshop in conjunction with Nexus trek breaks open new images of operational modes for the future.

Internal: House sends out Joey Armas to Brussels to participate in Service Ventures for continental self-support and celebrates Erik's second birthday.

Contradiction: Orchestrating eight PDL's in the next 21 days with broadest possible colleague participation while keeping everything else moving. (Week 1)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Misereor grant comes in for another year, and John Scully from the EEC calls saying there is money available for ICA: Portugal proposal, Training Centre construction continues finishing the floors, ceiling and windows.

Internal: House gathers back for the first time after Continental Council and discontinuity and receives warm welcome of villagers and inkind gifts of potatoes, vegetables and a storeroom. A diesel Peugeot is bought, giving us wheels once more. Quarterly planning is done interspersed with construction; Branca Ramalho is sent out to her village of Bigorne after one and a half years of living in ICA House.

Contradiction: Completely finishing with House/Training Centre construction to launch us out the door and into the new year. (Week 2)

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: Four P.D.L.'s are complete, four are scheduled with two more yet to be confirmed. Volunteer Service Programme proves successful to the extent that a tentative set up of sojourn training in Brussels and Rome is anticipated.

Internal: Joe Dixon returns as House completes internal life planning.

Contradiction: Symbolising and marking the arenas which are under control. (Week 13)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: House prepares dossier for presentation to Ministry of Cooperation by Ambassador M. Stephane Hessel. Mr. Alain Revel participates in final form of dossier with helpful advice on style of the document. Three colleagues work on translations of profile questionnaire, the Kingsley script and letter and a presentation for Fondation de France. Meetings with ISG students who helped recruit May 7th RDS, opens possibilities of their taking on project documentation (1). Global advisors and steering committee move into action by putting four workshops on financing the IERD on the calendar and by taking responsibility for organizing them. One is to be with private business, another with professional agricultural organizations, and two with government ministries (13).

Internal: "What if" collegium provides context for wildest dreams and the bare bones priorities (contrast a 5-person work camp in Paris and full-time permeation troupe being the only one here for the next two months) (1). Portuguese song and conversation enrich an evening as Lamego colleagues meet the president of a cooperative in Guinea Bissau (formerly Portuguese). They share approaches that work. ICA learns about renovation plans for its neighborhood at mayor's meeting to inform associations and professionals. The social worker responsible for our housing tells us how she hopes our association can be a bridge between separated ethnic groups in the ensemble of 4000 apartments (13)

Contradiction: Being overdependent on the public sector for IERD funding. Developing more spokesperson ability and availability, quickly, to present the IERD effectively while our best and most experienced spokesman is away. (Week 13,1)*

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: House welcomes Academy grads as they move out from Brussels to see some of Europe and share the story of their eight weeks. Amsterdam Region circuit to attend IERD Steering Committee meeting and regional team meeting starts dialogue over form of ICA when Order is no longer resident in Amsterdam. Project visitation circuit involves House and members of NSC in northern Frankfurt Region.(9) The globe came to the House as it hosted Kang Byang Hoon from Korea and one of Sapporo's English students, Mr. Itagaiki. IERD funding proposals took up the lion's share of the House's time.(6)

Internal: Unexpected plans of the city to use a part of the backyard force us to harvest some of our green tomatoes and pumpkins and to make relish and jelly and celebrate the abundance of the garden.(9) The training dynamic became real in the form of one more person to the Academy for a module of training, and Jorg Mayer completing his second week of sojourning in the House.(6)

Contradiction: Creating a way to focus our corporate mind on the coming year in the midst of diffused individual tasks. Allowing the story that 'We can't plan until after the Academy' to block significant action relative to self-support. (Weeks 6-9)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: NSC meets and selects 10 possible projects then breaks into teams of two or three for visits. Four projects are visited the first week revealing hither to unknown funding possibilities. Regional Council is held with 18 colleagues representing all aspects of the ICA work, creating strategies for the Volunteer Program, courses, Roundtables and IERD.

Internal: Three team members visit Brussels for IE pedagogy and development push. New post box, telephone, and office are procured for the region. Geroen Gerats has Kate over for lots of singing and schedules first planning session to begin implementing strategies from the Regional Council.

Contradiction: Discerning the clear and eventful steps after project selection that will involve the team and NSC in getting a group off to Delhi. (Weeks 1-3)*

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: A visit with the General Council of the Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother indicates both involvement in our Year of Order Council and a potential contribution of \$5,000 for India. Contact is re-established with Rome's Methodist Minister and the activities of his congregation.

Internal: News of four volunteers arriving in November from England motivates efforts for house repairs. All available rooms are filled with boarders, new typing job and English student are secured.

Contradiction: Practical necessities draw off cash and energy from the task. (Week 1)

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Executive Committee of National Steering Committee meets to discuss funding sources. Letter is written to be mailed to companies for funding seeking to break open private sector support. Two training sessions for workshop leaders for the Symposium are held with Hannerl Golda.

Internal: Christel Otke is sent out after sojourning for three weeks.

Contradiction: Finding ways to use NSC member strength to advantage when meeting at one time and in one place seems impossible. (Week 1)

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: HDTI completes the first week with 33 non-staff Egyptians around the table. Cluster village visitation, celebration and workday are highlights of the week (3). First HDTI in Area Cairo opens with 23 participants, eight guests, and five faculty. Participants represent all seven local units in the Beni Suef Markaz after district chief sends out letter encouraging participation (2).

Internal: Fiona Kinsman is sent on to Abidjan assignment after one week stop over due to full flights. House celebrates David Coffman's birthday (3). House welcomes deployed youth Jessica Rettig and Carol Griffin and hosts Fiona Kinsman as she waits for flight to her assignment in Area Abidjan.

Contradiction: Maintaining HDTI momentum and teaching quality with five full time faculty (only two bilingual) and when anticipated grants that would enable fieldwork have not yet arrived. Creating a winning model that will allow three seasoned faculty, two translators, one development troop and one on self-support to teach a ten week HDTI, monitor three nations' IERD project selection and preparation, raise USD 80,000 ICA and USD 8100 OE for the quarter, maintain actuation momentum and expand with VM to the district level. (Weeks 1,3)*

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: Visit with Mme. Farley of Canadian Embassy brings us another installment of grant money, and enlists her help on IERD survey. We find more ways to do self-support through possible contracts with Golf Hotel and DHL International for English teaching.

Internal: House works together to clean the garden.

Contradiction: Finding a logistical way of starting the new quarter. (Week 12)

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Project visitation team in Jos Region, sponsored by Plateau State Ministry of Rural Development, joins ICA to look at six projects for possible IERD documentation; the six members of the team represent four sectors.

Internal: House celebrates completion of 1981 ICA Finance Statement by Arthur Young, Osindero and Moret, and secures inkind commitment.

Contradiction: Daring to discern the long range collegial structure that builds and sustains the Movement while enmeshed in implementing IERD. (Week 10)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Shell and British Petroleum commits to a contribution of fuel. Meetings were held by the NSC and Sub Committees. A community development association meeting was held to plan for transfer of management.

Internal: Completion of new collegium room decor gives lift to spirit.

Contradiction: Ensuring time for long range planning, while intrusions demand immediate attention. (Week 1)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: The Panchayat visits all sections and Nairobi House. First edition of weekly newsletter "Santiya NV, (Voice of the New Village Movement) is published and distributed to all Houses. NSC meets and selects eight projects to be represented at IERD as SCC (Swedish Cooperative Centre) team visits cooperatives in Bungoma and is overwhelmed by effectivity of ICA's planning methods. Ministry of Finance and Planning is asked for KSh. 10 million over the next four years as we go for the "Big One".

Internal: Emmanuel Ward and Stuart Wright, Order Youth, arrive in time to participate with House as Panchayat team leads us in visioning the future, capped by funny skits on the Year of the Council.

Contradiction: How to get the long range implementaries started while meeting the demands of the immediate. (Week 2)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: This is a week of many site visits from Freedom from Hunger, introducing rabbit raising to the families doing intensive gardens; USAID, funding the breast feeding health training programme; and Barclays Bank, considering general funding of the New Village Movement. Six volunteer village health caretakers from Katina (1), Muslim (2), Kawangware (2) and Kamitha (1) all in Kawangware sub-location complete two months of intensive health training and are prepared to work with the Kabiro Clinic for 6 months to improve health training in their village. Kabiro staff participates in Ndimi Consult in Keranyaga District, location impact in Kigumo Division, Murang'aa District, and the New Skills Training School in Sevagram, India.

Internal: Hubert returns from India while Sam returns from Ndimi and leaves for Project Directors' meeting and Jeremiah returns from Kigumo and leaves for Kikera as all celebrate using the new gas cooker.

Contradiction: How to maintain the momentum of development when all meetings must be legally approved until after the elections on 26 Sept '83. (Week 8)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Week of Consult set-up includes section circuits to two new sites as well as Mundobelwa and Kaganda Houses. Kalwani House circuits home sub-location at Senende and sets Health Training in Ivora. Team speaks to officials and all headmen of a whole location on authorisation trip, spins on resurgence research in Kenya and receives great affirmation of replication scheme.

Internal: Panchayat visit links us up to our globality giving opportunity to renew our sense of being an experiment on behalf of the two million villages as well as new challenge of modifying Quarter II timeline so the intensification we've planed can be a victory!

Contradiction: Doing a full quarter's work in 10 weeks with little flexibility in numbers of staff and assuring time to refresh. (Week 2)*

NAIROBI—THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: In the past week, we held a fantastic VLC in the division for three days with 50 people, a Locational Assembly in Kinyona with 20 people, and a Community Workday with 153 people cementing the collegium floor for community center.

Internal: The House hosted Larry Philbrook from Section C for VLC, sent Nelson Sayia to Gatuto for setting up the Week 7 Consult and Patrick Mbulu to hospital.

Contradiction: Operating out all programmes in the midst of conflict government meeting and limited House finances plus scarcity of water. (Week 5)

MOMBASA—THE KAMWELENI HOUSE

External: The Village Development Committee with the help of ICA staff submitted companies proposal documents to private sectors for the Nguluku community centre materials. The Government District Officer accepted the motivational ICA style in initiating methods on community total organization which resulted in upgrading the public road and came up with 16 K-M road repair.

Internal: The House welcomed two section great circuiters (John Kivuva and Larry Philbrook) during the week of stipends distribution. It was a great week of celebrating for staff interchange. The House sent Paul S. Kilouzo with his new decision of marrying Mary Kithuka to the Kamweleni House.

Contradiction: How to reschedule Quarter I time line cautiously in light of leftover Weeks 9 & 10 activities. (Week 12)

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: Three below poverty line' women of Maliwada start sewing class under "TRYSEM" scheme. Guilds formed in the Asegaon village meeting to take necessary actions in their work. Twenty-five people from 4-sectors donated 475Rs. within a three day Annual Appeal. Youth of Fatiabad have collected youth mandal registration fee (1). Village Leaders' Conference with 45 participants from Maharashtra is held in Maliwada. Maliwada Leaders' meeting is held to look toward the future plan. V.L.C. document is written by its team. Two village leaders from cluster attended Pune RDS. Government is given permission to start sewing classes in village. Eye camp has been set up for cluster villages. New brochure is written to print on Maliwada Council by Mr. Joe and villagers celebrated Gandhi Festival(13).

Internal: Quarter II training model is started with witness preparation. The collegium on United Kingdom by WCDS volunteer Jackie Cook enlightened the ashram about "Life Style in the United Kingdom". House hosted Anand Warne from Chikhale for Annual Appeal and symbolised the victory with a fine celebration (1). Ashram sent out Ben Chapman to Annual Appeal at Panavel. Yeshanker's family arrived to access of new assignment. One American family visited this ashram and project. New office is set up (13).

Contradiction: Changing the image of local and government people when implementing schemes and development programmes in the village from 'working alone' to 'working together'. Establishing confidence in the Aurangabad bi-Metro's four sector and cluster village so that the project programmes become their responsibility. (Weeks 13,1)*

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Completion of 10 village meetings in the Cluster sets the stage for an exciting HDA meeting with over 40 villagers and all four sectors present. Topics include bank loans re-activation of Ambar Charkha with the addition of a loom to produce cloth, formation of a cluster health guild, and legalizing the HDA so that it can establish a marketplace. Meeting dates are set for the first health guild meeting and the next HDA meeting to be held in Panvel (13). Elder from Chikhale village, only village leader outside of Maliwada returns from Village Leaders Conference in Maliwada standing tall. First village meeting in cluster is held and many others set as all 12 cluster villages are visited in preparation for HDA meeting. Annual Appeal is launched with 50R's in hand, 1501R's committed, 9500Rs working, and 25m,000Rs targeted (12). Following a week of getting almost all new troops situated in the ashram and quarter planning on Week 11, troops visit cluster villages and recruit for village leaders conference. Visits to government officials and key guardians reveals mutual anticipation for an exciting year. Annual Appeal strategy sessions with four guardians establishes confidence in reaching our bottom-line of 10,000Rs (11).

Internal: Week of excitement with colleagues coming and going for PDL and Annual Appeal, return of the bicycle after three months in the repairshop, and a great HDA sparks wild family night of acrobatics on the top floor (kranti chowk) of the ashram, including the "elephant walk" introduced from the U.S. (13). Four hour "collegium" with guardian Vijay Lokhande, focused on past, present and future images of HDA, builds corporate resolve to release its full potential as the necessary structure for human development in the cluster and block (12). Creating our missional story and holding a workday in ashram that includes cleaning, renovating sleeping quarters, painting the collegium room and making improvements towards a demonstration kitchen, signals troop readiness (11).

Contradiction: Integrating the local task with Area strategies for effective action in each village. Creating solid plans that engages all the troops and puts us where we need to be at the end of Week 13 (12). How to do the intensive task in the cluster while positioning ourselves to do the extensive task of the block. (Week 11,13)

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Two CYFs are held for 75 students in Deogaon Ashram School and 61 students in Vaitarna High School. Three Adivasi people are sent from cluster village, Chandrachi Meth, to Nasik for driving course. Three day cluster consult has 70 people participating.

Internal: Principal Mr. M. S. Gosavi of Byr College visits Vaviharsh Ashram and talks on NSS Camp. Ashram receives new paint and decor and internal life training begins for new staff.

Contradiction: Completing cluster documentation as soon as possible so that it can be shown to four-sector people. (Week 7)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: With the paperwork now complete, BAIF inspect the site of their second proposed percolation tank in Jawale. Villagers receive an unexpected call from the BDO who later accompanies BAIF's site visit. Rs1,000 from the S.S.S. organization are received to assist the cluster's health programme.

Internal: Cluster newsletters are printed for distribution. The EG at last have two new benches to suit their size and the House sends out Kevin Boivin to Fifth City after working in Jawale for one year and in India for four.

Contradiction: Completing our tasks effectively with time, money and transportation threatening to disrupt the programme. (Week 6)

PUNE—THE MAALE HOUSE

External: Forty farmers meet in Male for a 2-day programme on Labour Training. The C.Y.F. in Male village was attended by 65 boys and girls, and proved to be very effective for cluster work. Two teams are now working on Annual Appeal in Kolhapur, Sangli, and Miraj.

Internal: Construction of a good collegium room and good staff facilities highlight the week. Part of the facility is the toilets which will be completed in the next three days as one of the demonstration toilets in the Male Project. We also fixed the magan chula (stove) in the kitchen.

Contradiction: How to help people understand each other and work together. (Week 12)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: Buldard engineers submit building estimate and drinking water is repaired. B.A.I.F. advises Budhoda village people about future planning. Shivaji holds birthday fair and Budhoda village people participate. New information about Ambar Charkha industries land arrives as Budhoda builds Ambedkar statue.

Internal: House has celebration with Area Team member Ambaji Kamble.

Contradiction: None submitted (week 5)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: Collector of Wardha district comes to community centre to inaugurate "Wine Shop Week" and celebrate Gandhi's 114th birthday. District Superintendent of Police distributes Rangoli and Kabadi prizes. Prohibition Department showed "Keewan" movie. Cluster preschool teachers gather for next plan. Youth module does Grand Shramadham and a cluster circuit and fixes date for economic module with D.R.D.A.

Internal: Hingamghatwala Shophupr who has given money for Maliwada VLC as did Surekha Thakker, a Marathi movie actor visits the House.

Contradiction: How to engage all the shops when we don't have coming Quarter plan. (Week 13)

NAGPUR—THE TEMBHURWAHI HOUSE

External: Denada Societies distribution loan for 21 people in the cluster. We celebrated Gandhi's birthday on 2nd Oct. and visited Manohav Sapre (district member M.S.E.B.) and submitted proposal for Cluster Village Electricity.

Internal: New volunteer from England arrived in ashram. Mr. Chate, Police Sub-Inspector visits Ashram.

Contradiction: Circuit cluster people are busy in the field. How to engage them with 4-sector work all together. (Week 2)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: Preschool shed is built in Jambron and Medhda holds shramdan and meeting with Gram Sevak. Managing Director of Village Bank in Pradhpur adopts six cluster villages.

Internal: Wood is obtained for Ashram repairs, S. Sawarkhed arrives from Sevagram and Prasad family is sent out on discontinuity. Marathi classes start.

Contradiction: Setting up Global Women's Forums without any educated women on the staff. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Cluster activities gain momentum as first economic survey is completed toward Canara Bank loans with interviews of 20 households (75%) in signal Bijapur Village. Sorohi Village Health Camp inoculated 96 children. Kot the 4th of five cluster villages, opens Women's Centre with new sewing machine and nine paid registrations. Cluster 6-month report booklet is off the press and delivered to sponsors netting Rs. 6000. Annual Appeal has 50% bottomline in hand and the rest committed with a week to go.

Internal: Saturday workday transforms House while plans are laid for building new roof-top collegium to hold 50. Study collegium on Summer '83 sets stage for Year of Order Council work. E.G. curriculum is drafted and Saturday English classes in-house begin with fervour.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the week to assure that the foundational pillars to the Quarter stand. (Week 13)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Director of Agriculture Extension, Government of India, flies from New Delhi to participate in the entire Madras Rural Development Symposium, and comments on the effectiveness of ICA methods in bringing a diverse group together to share their experiences. Madras RDS (sixth in a series of RDS in southern India), is an outstanding success with strong participation throughout by the four sectors; the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Tamil Nadu, the Secretary of Agriculture Tamil Nadu, an ex-member of the Planning Commission, The President of South India Chambers of Commerce and Industry, and the Chairman of the Centre for Rural Development, Indian Institute of Technology all participate and speak during the inauguration. This RDS was set up by the mutual efforts of one local voluntary agency, one prestigious university, three chambers of commerce and the ICA. Eighty-six people participated in the Symposium.

Internal: Annual Appeal and Project Description Laboratory teams join forces with local troops from the Area and are immediately dispersed across the Area.

Contradiction: Coordinating the variety of demands that breaklooses in the cluster work, IERD and Development have placed upon us. (Week 12)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal brings in Rs50,000. PDL's mailing is completed with one confirmation with the Nimpith ashram of Ramakrishna Missions. Meetings with new secretary of United Social Welfare Centre and Bstee Local Committee propels bustee programme planning forward.

Internal: Use of new office at Tata Centre creates more effective communications dynamic serving all programme arenas. YOC day during State Bundh (Strike) allows for reflection and model building for Quarter YOC structures.

Contradiction: Launching maneuvers on many fronts with minimal set up. (Week 13)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: We send the whole set-up team to the first Rural Development Interchange Workshop (RDIW) in Medan, set for Oct. 10. New, streamlined RDIW facilitation and follow-up schedule is designed, and all of the materials are created to enable the meetings. One module on Clerical Management sold to a major multi-national, first of twelve targeted for the year.

Internal: First full week of new House structures is implemented successfully. House office is enlarged as we remodel and set up new decor and begin new computer training to enable teamwork and office efficiency. House and Michael Neat celebrate his 32nd birthday.

Contradiction: Motivating colleagues, the Indonesian Steering Committee, and sponsoring organizations to fully engage in order to bring off the upcoming Jakarta RDIW. (Week 1)*

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Two ICA staff are invited by the Head of Private School of Kec. T. Pura to do an Effective Leadership Workshop on OSIS (students) with 78 participants. Quarter II manoeuvre planning is done to keep our feet on the road. An RDIW Facilitators Training is held in preparation for the Medan RDIW.

Internal: House celebrates two birthdays with dinner party for Carolina Reusoral's 29th birthday and Kristoffer Reusora's third birthday. Victory celebration before Rural Development Interchange workshop with nine guests from Kec. T. Puna included L.D. The from Jakarta.

Contradiction: Getting local steering committee to take responsibility for site visits while trying to keep on top of marketing and development with fewer troops! (Weeks)*

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: Final draft of 1982-1983 Annual Report cum newsletter is completed and model is built for producing it at a minimal cost.

Internal: S. Krishnan is sent out to Indonesia for several weeks for enabling the campaign of RDS.

Contradiction: Allowing a breakloose of creativity in transforming our space with images for the next year and getting it all finished within a week with the staff left in the House. (Week)

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: The second harvest of rice make villagers of Bontoa very busy, since at about 50 Ha, it is largest second rice planting in Bontoa history that the farmers could remember. RDS set up is on schedule, and to be held on October 24 in Ujung Pandang in cooperation with University of Hasanuddin. Visit to government offices gives new idea as to who will be responsible for the continuation of Bontoa Project when the staff moves out.

Internal: Collegium on Saemaul Undong makes everyone more interested in village development. The House has one day discontinuity to celebrate Lebaran Hajji, attends four wedding celebrations in the village which brings possibility to Bruhan Zam who will marry next week.

Contradiction: Moving quickly on RDS and "hand-over" project while having difficulties getting to see government officers. (Weeks 11,12)

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: House participates in the final lap of documentation with only one more to go. Final date is set for Philippine Symposium in early December. The NSC lays out the initial names possible for delegates to India and sees the "Ben Kingsley" video. House picks up ink film from Kodak and a promise for P11,000 for the year; a visit to Citybank gets a promise of support for any major expansion in Sudtonggan. Ben Aguirang visits the House and goes through the initial model for expansion in Tiwi.

Internal: Two volunteers arrive from the Netherlands and immediately begin to create a program on the computer to assist our budget sessions. Three tickets are inkinded from Boat Company for Cebu. Elizabeth arrives from Hong Kong. Most entertaining board meeting held yet with a yes for extra nationals' year visas. Msgr. Ortiz gives thanks for the ICA's problems as he considers them blessings in disguise.

Contradiction: Defining the missional task and team clearly enough to allow time for internal life reflections. (Week 2)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Proposal for year-long training program for Time Inc., Asia, is created and submitted.

Internal: House has party to celebrate Jack's 39th birthday.

Contradiction: Locating the gas to power our IERD Implementation Vehicle. (Week 4)

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: House member and two Steering Committee members pay visit to two government department chairmen (both on ROC IERD Advisory Board) who promise their financial support for IERD, which, after CAPD (Council of Agriculture Planning & Department) promise of two weeks ago, completes the public sector half of ROC IERD funding! We send out over 150,000NT-worth of development proposals (at least 100,000 committed). Phillips Taiwan calls after months of brooding to request a Meeting Management Module for their Chung Li plant managers (2). Steering Committee member goes on visit that gains Ambassador Hotel's agreement to support the RDS. Nineteen Development calls net NT\$149,000 committed in one week. Local branch of Continental Bank announces computerization plans which give the House hope of receiving statements that don't spread five lines of data over two pages (1).

Internal: Panchayat arrives (John and Clare) with Don Cramer, welcomed by freshly cleaned, decored, rearranged, new guest-roomed house. During the week individual House members spend discontinuous moments jostling crowds at the National "Double Ten" parade reveling at the Taiwan Electronic Show, and marveling at a Marcel Marceau performance (2). House celebrates Gordon's birthday (also Gandhi Day) by eating at the only Indian restaurant in Taipei, and Paul Mayama, ICA: Japan Board Director, joins the celebration at weekly ritual (1).

Contradiction: Thinking of ways to move (on the IERD), while experiencing suspended animation. Scheduling corporate time to generate consensus and momentum on new projects amid strong momentum of longer-term, equally urgent work. (Weeks 1,2)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Informal session of ICA and auxillary include dynamic exchange between MSSD local workers and the PCDW Provincial Community Development Workers.

Internal: House sends out Casquijo for one week discontinuity. House experiments with secular ritual. In the middle of the night a sneak thief carries off all clocks in House leaving Zambo team timelessly suspended in space.

Contradiction: The rocky road has become a mountain avalanche. The boulders that are striking our heads are labeled "Spend Little and "Get it Done". (Week)*

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: Mactan Island Agro Industrial Fair is three days. Staff participated in this big event with the Sudtonggan Demonstration Farm vegetables product being displayed as well as the rock and craft industry product also displayed. San Miguel free clinic (successfully with the 80% patient in the community) had been consulted to the doctor being requested (8). The House received some clinic supplies from the open Emergency Hospital. Sudtonggan Free-Clinic-Mactan-24 ELNC teachers are training the four villages in the north and east division. New Buyer of Rock Industry products from Manila (7).

Internal: Ministry of Human Settlement team visits Sudtonggan training center to have information how the project was started and the journey in it. John Dalton an Australian man from Padap also visits Sudtonggan training center for a short conversation about what is going on now in the project. Tamaraw Service has its new seats. This is the first time of seat renovation (8). Fred Estorgio arrived from Iloilo documentation in Kabsaka project. House celebration with the Mactan-24 ELNC teachers. University students from the South Westen University visited Sudtonggan training center to have a briefing (7).

Contradiction: Focusing internal life in the midst of external do's. Budgeting the time for the Annual Agro-Fair and the coming soon Panchayat. (Week 7,8)*

DAVAO-LANGUB

External: MSSD distribute the third batch of rice to drought victims. Monthly baby weighing is completed and reported this quarter. Mr Cesar Gante donates lumber for Langub preschool building. Highlight of the year is the 5th Anniversary Fair for LHDP and Mountain Cluster Project, attended by the Ministry of Health, POPCOM, MSSD, BPI, MEC and two international staff from Manila and 200 people from the cluster.

Internal: Cluster workers participate in house painting and repair and extending road to the highway.

Contradiction: Beginning the think-tank for next year's work and developing proposals for different agencies to support the program. (Week ?)

DAVAO-MAHAYAG

External: We visit Provencial Engineer Office. Men of P.E.O. arrive and fix broken pipe & repairs Delusom well. House discovers three sources of water at staff house site by modern adaptation of ancient practice of water divination using stainless steel well.

Internal: House decides on their own Roundtable study on historical interpretation of the forces that have influenced change in the Mindanao Island.

Contradiction: The boulders have thudded down the Mountain... we are now caught in our oggles in order to see the larger vision...(Week 2)*

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

Internal: The Japanese Foreign Ministry decides to send one delegate from their Ministry to the IERD. Toemachi calls to schedule a second T.M. after the first T.M. solved the community's water problem. Hong Kong Nexus stays after Area Council to set up 21 development calls and write proposals (9). Area Council gathers in Hiuo City for eight days in which reconfiguration and four year strategy are major themes. All members of Japanese Houses, colleagues, Nexus and Seoul representatives give in-put to new decisions. ICA Board of Directors meet to hear reports of Chicago and Area Council, update on Japan IERD, and reflect on reconfiguration. A positive and responsive support for the year (8).

Internal: 1982 Academy Grad Takako Kowamura announces her decision to intern in the Tokyo House. First step of reconfigurations send out Pattersons to Osaka House with a sushi party (9). Celebration of life's journies with Paul Patterson's 8 birthday and David and Joyce Reese's 32nd anniversary (8).

Contradiction: Drawn out reconfiguration schedule delays Tokyo regional planning and implementation. Moving rapidly but with great strategic care to cover new configuration. (Weeks 9&8)

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Work continues on IERD village selection and funding. A key funding visit was made to Chung Buk Province to meet the head of Home Affairs, Mrs. Lee Sung Woo.

Internal: The returning trio from Brussels, Park Yong Chul, Min Sung and Han Kyung Ae pass on their way home.

Contradiction: Pulling together all the people and pieces to organize a great Regional Council next week. (Week 9)

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: Panchayat visit enables the Team to do special visits in the zone. Team and guests were hosted by the Provincial Chief of Bureau of Home Affairs; culster visit enables documentation of new life and John Patterson's address to Chun Berk University class of 200 precedes a visit to the president of the university. These visits confirm for the team the image of an excellent ICA frame in the zone.

Internal: The team experiences being gloriously inundated by festival life as the Panchayat visit occasions a Tea House happening. John Han San Schwoebel celebrates his Dolyabe, first year birthday, Korean style, including an ancient tradition of delivering rice, cakes and neighbors with all the family dressed in Hanboks; Miss Seung celebrates 46 years on the journey and Um Young Hum is sent out to prepare for attending seminary.

Contradiction: Moving the zonal development efforts down the road while troops are dispersed in missional tasks within the region. (Week 2)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: Shizuyo Sato attends two meetings in preparation for our part in the Village Symposium in Krume. The women's class will bake cookies and cakes to sell at the event where last year 250,000 people were present. Our part will be with about 200 and will include an excerpt from the Kingsley tape. Our volunteer from Norway says "yes" and we expect him by the end of November.

Internal: The Order Study on Tuesday evening from 9:00 to 10:30 is a fruitful period at the end of a long, hard day. Christmas Party plans are set for December 18th; "little house repairs" and prep for the English Intensive keep us sharp.

Contradiction: Creating a helpful daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly and yearly time rhythm for our lives which gives us "charge" of our time instead of all the niggling and large demands being "in charge" of us. (Week 2)*

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: The regional team gathers to give Kenji Yoneda a hearty farewell as he leaves for his new assignment in Tokyo. Among those present for the send out were three new Town Meeting participants. Jim Patterson and Keiji spent the week checking signals on new assignments.

External: Staff and colleagues attending International Women's Club party encounter excitement over the Volunteer Symposium results. Governor of Hokhaido's wife invites us over to her house. Three people are committed for next year's Philippine Work Camp during initial phone recruitment (3). Forty-two participants including UNESCO, Japan Peace Corps, Rotary, and Buddhist youth groups attended the Volunteer Symposium on Hokkaido's development cooperation with the world. The 10 leading local banks and businesses support the Symposium IERD manoeuvres for a local delegation begin with visits to the governors office and funding advisors (1,2).

Internal: House sends out Margaret Piper and is visited by Suzanne Heilman.

Contradiction: Accelerating structural relationships between Murrin Bridge and Lake Cargellig. (Week 12)

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Representatives from Sydney and Murrin Bridge Houses join us for IERD check signals meeting and plan trek to Alice Springs, N.S.A. meeting and National Laugh Cola event. Ten signal communities have returned data forms for IERD participation.

Internal: Eight E. G. and the Newkirk family go camping in the mountains during V.J.L., highlights being Scavenger Hunt and ice cream feast. Barry and Margaret celebrate completed life of mother Nita Claire Oakley age 93 yrs. She was a pioneer, active in the three great waves of history.

Contradiction: Figuring out what we can do for council rather than what the council can do for us. (Week 6)

AREA SUVA

APIA - THE NUKU'ALOFA HOUSE

External: Fetu'u and Terry leave for Vava'u with fine networking manoeuvres. Roundtable begins the huge translation task for the PTS with corporate work. Cheque from Johnson and Johnson (NZ) brings PTS funds over \$1,000 mark.

Internal: A week of fine collegiums on frame, Order Council Year and the Third Wave inspire day long conversations.

Contradiction: Creating eventfulness in the midst of long march toward the PTS and faculty training. (Week 2)*

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

Contradiction: Shifting into fifth gear in a four-speed model. (Week 1)

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: House writes maneuvers for each pole of the Year of Order Council triangle. Receives note of thanks and a check for \$10,000 following a visit with Bob Trull done in the midst of a Trull family tragedy (3). The announcement by NSC of six projects from area Houston to go to Delhi plenary is celebrating occasion for the first meeting of complete tri-regional Day 1 "army" in office; and launches House participation in continental prep for PDL, database and fund raising (2).

Internal: House completes internal work including a refreshing two week rhythm time design (3). Lela Mosley returns from the Brussels Academy and Lily Fox goes to East Waterloo, Iowa to talk about the Fifth City Model to interested community people.

Internal: The House sends Sharon Heiges out to her new assignment in Madrid

Contradiction: Integrating the implications of the Year of Order Council with our local mission. (Week 10)

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE External: The Lorimor team comes down for Annual Appeal wrap-up and Regional PSU. The House is now the proud owner of a Kay-Pro computer to be used for self-support and House. The Metro decides to hold evening House Churches twice a month (1). Kansas City House hosts two video events with Kansas City friends (13).

Internal: Life is highlighted by the celebration of Annual Appeal picnic in which both Houses participate along with two Chicago representatives. Marie Sharp leads a series of collegiums on Phase I while she is here (1). The youth are busy with an abundance of work, promising a good year with respect to self-support.

Contradiction: Spreading leadership of House to expand external mission. Maintaining ongoing corporate schedule to mesh with eventful time design. (Weeks 13,1qtr2)

LORIMOR HDP

External: The E. Waterloo community experiences the "Wonder of Winning" through a community clean up day, in the rain; it's first public effort, with the TV cameras recording the event. The Hunger Taskforce of the United Methodist Church, Iowa, designates \$5,000 to the work of the ICA this year. The Chicago Area enters it's first Approaches That Work Project into the Global Data Base through the modum at the Data Office in Lorimor (3). Circuits to Waterloo, Cedar Rapids, Ames, Lincoln, Ne. and Kansas City keep teams on the road. Presentations to Coon Rapids and Grundy Center churches uncovers people looking for significant engagement and very interested in our approach. LENS facilitators training weekend prepares 30 men and women from different parts of the region in the LENS process (2).

Internal: Gail West, Iris Boivin, Dallas Ziggenhorn, Mark Rebstock and Lori Haman represent the Order: Ecumenical at the burial service and celebration of the completed life of our colleague Wesley Salmon in Macksville, K.S. on October 22, 1983 (3). Gail West and Gene Boiven return from the NSC, Area-Regional Priors meeting and Areal/Global computer repository creation in Chicago. K.C. Houses gather for Fiscal Management Taskforce meeting with film festival and champagne breakfast (2).

Contradiction: Breaking through authentic engagement forms in relation to a two year strategy beyond programmatic follow up. Identifying arenas of corporate focus so that individuals are given permission to audaciously build releasing models. (Weeks 2,3)*

THE MINNEAPOLIS HOUSE

External: LENS International spends the week working with the regional team on the Design Conference and targeting key corporations in the Twin Cities. The third session of the Roundtable was highlighted by an intense conversation on the "Peace Movement in our Time" and a reflection on talks sharing individual stories of life and mission. A team does site visits to IMPACT 7 in Wisconsin and Central in Northfield, Minnesota (1). Saturday Champagne Breakfast with House and regional team celebrates the \$18,000 Annual Appeal victory and launches the quarter with an "A" money development workshop, and sends out Justin Morrill to Nexus with \$10,000 from sideline "B" maneuvers. Central High School Student Council Retreat reveals that the seniors have been training the juniors and sophomores in participatory methods, and ICA facilitators can now sit back and watch self-reliance in action: A great day (13).

Internal: The House and the Regional Team spend Saturday winterizing in preparation for the cold north winds (1). Second Declaration Roundtable features three "old hands" speaking to an attentive and diverse crowd on their worldviews, their role with ICA and the past, present and future mission of ICA, generating very lively discussion and reflection (13).

Contradiction: Configuring the best use of resources to get the missional task done. Designing the imaginal time and space that will release the teamwork needed to creatively conquer the complexity facing us. (Week 1,13)

THE DETROIT HOUSE

External: Three thousand four hundred and twenty dollars is in hand for the Annual Appeal with \$16,432 pledged, \$200 in the mail and \$7,000 in proposals(12). Fourteen at regional team meeting launched Annual Appeal. Advertising firm of Walter Thompson contributes V.H.S.(11).

Internal: A new 40+ T.V., three free lifetime memberships with the Video Club, and the introduction to a low cost dental care plan are inked(12). Thirty-eight people celebrated completed life of Atsumo (Artie) Matsuoka at Memorial House Church (11).

Contradiction: Breaking loose colleagues to a deepened sense of responsibilities for time and financial support. Developing new systems and approaches that work for Annual Appeal and regional release. (Weeks 11,12)

THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: Ten Regional Team troops are on circuits for IERD and Annual Appeal follow up; five showcase projects are identified, \$1500 in hand, \$1,000 committed, Appalachia Brochures are mailed, Edgemont Solar Gardens (Dayton) is verified for India Plenary, and eleventh hour details from Warren Showcase Forum and Appalachia RDS are on timeline.

Internal: Brother Ed Zamierowski of Marianist Order adds to Resurgence Research with collegium on history and structure of the Marianists.

Contradiction: Perceiving the pace that is humanly impossible and historically relevant. (Week 3)*

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: Loisaida Employment Taskforce meeting has 32 people in attendance with representation from the NY State Department of Commerce and NY City Department of Employment. Individual guilds decide to meet to accomplish their assignments before next taskforce meeting. New York Region Annual Report is completed and mailed to entire mailing list.

Internal: House is filled with boarders from Japan, Germany, Australia, Brooklyn, Chicago and Caracas. Longer term boarders volunteer to assist in building renovations

Contradiction: Breaking through gap in development income with only one third September program check earned. (Week 2)*

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: A training event held in Buffalo prepares western half of the regional team to deliver advertised mini-programs. Team sets follow-up event and agrees to take responsibility for invitations. Pledges and checks continue to arrive in the mail as results of the Annual Appeal.

Internal: House hosts Panchayat Trek and regional team with 12 people around the table.

Contradiction: Creating coalitions which work faster than the world's timeline. (Week 2)*

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: One thousand four hundred and seventy dollars in Annual Appeal money comes in this week—\$800 of it is a contribution from a Baltimore artist who donated the proceeds from her recent art sale. Invitations to the first IERD benefit are mailed, and first returns come in after two days with 20 people saying "yes" and \$385 in-hand. Program PSU produces a unifying symbol on the next 16 months as well as a plan for Quarter II. Private agencies in International Development (P.A.I.D.) call to remind us that we've missed recent meetings and they've missed us!

Internal: Quarter II House life manual is completed and experimental time design is implemented. Hostelry program receives request from Philadelphia Lutheran Seminary for housing for 15 people Nov. 6-11 during 500th birthday celebration of Martin Luther.

Contradiction: Making Order assignments which create the interface that releases people to do the tasks before us this quarter. (Week 1)

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Reception for Panchayat and Area Priors at Women's City Club on Beacon Hill provides occasion for 24 Metro colleagues to enjoy Ben Kingsley, be introduced to the Year of Order Council and share their insights about where the future is breaking loose in Boston. Starks Workday No. 2 gives 10 people from Boston hands-on experience installing furnace ductwork and fireproof sheetrock.

Internal: Hosting the Panchayat and Area Priors is highlighted by "next 16 years" conversation, formation dialogue and dinner out where women and men go their separate ways for a very collegial experience.

Contradiction: Completing the Annual Appeal calls and creating the ongoing, practical system for keeping 60 days ahead on meeting our bottom lines. (Week 1)

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: Fifteen from beyond Starks join SEC regulars and House for great workday with further pilot furnace room, and wood prep progress. N.H. project is confirmed for IERD Delhi Event. Wreath 10 are all set for production. Woodworks chair sample is done and marketing brochure is mocked up.

Internal: House celebrates with SEC the great workday by having a spaghetti food and going roller skating.

Contradiction: Breaking through the marketing contradiction of the region. (Week 2)*

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: Region experiences a new breakloose as 20 people join the House to celebrate Thanksgiving dinner, and two people decide to become Day 1 volunteers. Four colleagues join in building the quarter programme calendar and research model. Project representatives let out whoops of joy when notified they are selected for India. A new age of relationships with religious orders begins as Lorne loan payback schedule is agreed upon and thousand of dollars of interest is forgiven.

Internal: House gets missional boost as the weekly time rhythm is finally consensed on and task teams are created.

Contradiction: Creating the context for effective engagement of volunteers. (Week 1)

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: Father Valiquette, Bishop Trembley and Claude Lalonde dialogue with the Panchayat at the House on the implications of the Church's care for urban society. New age movements, the latest being the Greens, show up on our doorstep in search of animation methods to give form to their vision (3). Habitations Jeanne-Mance organizes daytime bowling league based on stakes, Community rooms with the help of one of Montreal's top lawyers. Sisters of Charity visit the House for a Lorne update and resolution of financial commitments (1).

Internal: Wind up of great Panchayat visit takes the form of Japanese style teriaki feast and a collegium on teamhood from Humphrey Bogart in Treasure of Sirra Madre video (3). Presence of Area Priors occasions two days of planning for Quarter II and beyond, accompanied by development workshop and re-arrangement of office space (1).

Contradiction: Reminding ourselves about engaging others. Keeping the revolutionary Global View and maintaining spiritual context in the midst of the day to day demands. (Week 1,3)*

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Trip to State of Queretaro is made by House and ICA Board President and NSC member. Network of 35 active village projects initiated by Mexican Foundaton for Rural Development shows strong interest in methods of Human Development and local participation in IERD. Manuel works with Mahtews' in Los Reyes community. Youth are committed to bring off Youth Forum and ensure participation from San Camilo. House continues strategy of breakfast and IERD meetings (2). Circuit to State of Queretaro results in likely project for IERD. Local initiative is startling, including care for wider network of villages, mostly in agricultural improvement. Pre-selection committee of NSC meets and invites eight projects from RDS to participate. Letter and questionnaire is sent out. Open door is presented to work in all or any of Fundacion Mexicana's 45 economic projects around the whole nation (3).

Internal: Both Manuel Samayoa and Bill Allerging celebrate birthdays in same week. House inkinds 1976 four-door Renault. House gets facelift of rugs and curtains in corporate space (2). Order grives at the sudden death of Araceli Mathews, age 28 on October 12th. Araceli's family, Jim Mathews, Frank Hilliard, Bill and Phyllis Slicker, Dr. Bob Springs and House celebrate her life together (3).

Contradiction: Addressing ourselves to global push on IERD, Order Council and finances reveals utter necessity to intensify local program. Getting commitment from projects to select their own representatives to go to India and participate in Phase III. (Week 2,3)*

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: The team gets grounded in the regions of Central America as Peruvian colleagues Rocio and Joan Arce visit from El Salvador to participate in Panchayat visit and leave with the commitment to form an NSC in El Salvador and promise to fund El Salvador circuit by Guatemala ICA team. IERD breaks loose with key visits in all sectors and the promise of a November RDS. Emagua (Guatemala City Water Co.) gives technical expertise on irrigation problem moving irrigation project nearer completion.

Internal: Panchayat visit celebration in the midst of yearly village fair draws participants and onlookers as it moves from cantina (bar) complete with guitarists to marimba dance floor. Work on computer contract begins and draws out offer of disocunt software from local guardian for use in future contracts.

Contradiction: Creating the drama of the yearly priorities that informs our working configuration and strategies. (Week 1)

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External: Following HDTI graduation of 60 village leaders, implementation treks are held in Portland and St. Andrew in 10 villages with 28 meetings creating 2 year tactical timelines. Blue Mountain Yallah's Valley Cluster treks are begun with Rotary volunteers. IDB and NCB make 3 site visits to Woburn Lawn with full page ad in Gleaner on Woburn Lawn loan programme. Mary and Alice are welcomed back from Nairobi GRA. Presentation is made to 5 Methodist Churches. Lecture given to Cornell University graduate students at UWI. Princeton student and Peace Corps volunteers visit Woburn Lawn.(12-6) The Woburn Lawn Economix Development Cooperative Society Ltd. holds its Annual General Meeting and 3rd anniversary with officials from IDB, NCB and Co-op Dept. giving their praises. Alice Wright is re-elected as Chairman. Rotary International volunteer, Paul Crouch, who is Chairman of the Brother's Brother Foundation and former Managing Director of ALCOA in Jamaica, presents tools and books to the H.E.A.R.T. Trust and Library Service who present them to the Woburn Lawn Project through the Kingston Rotary Club. Pre Co-op meetings are held in the Blue Mtn. Cluster and 2 year tactical timelines are built in Yallah's Valley Cluster.(7)

Internal: House sends out Denison Pierre to Dominica and welcomes Rob and Nadine from the Global Council and Benjamin from the 6th grade rite of passage. House welcomes Bill and Dan Bingham on visit, holds celebration sending out a Dutch and an English volunteer and has first total House meeting in six weeks.

Contradiction: Filling full the practical implications of a replication strategy which pushes in new directions into unknown territory and sustaining, expanding and deepening the movement.(Weeks 12-7)

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: Week of planning scheduled a Foro Campaign to do 24 Foros in two provinces in the next two months at the same time a decision was made to send seven people to the Continental GRA Council and Priorship Training School in Caracas. Fourteen people from the cluster communities decided to be trained to lead the Foros to cover the staffing gap. Visited GAB member Mrs. Belaunde (first lady) with Panchayat and presented a proposal for IERD delegate funding which would have the ICA do programs in her urban "slum" projects. This is a new breakthrough in IERD funding - earning the money by doing programs.

Internal: Panchayat visit called forth a deeper understanding of the task of our Order in History and interns witnessed to their own significant role in this task.

Contradiction: Securing appropriate working office space in Lima to enable the expanding task. (Week 1)

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: Completion of 4th Human Development Training Laboratory with 32 participants and Jacobo Pacecho as Dean. Inkinded 15 minute movie on Caño Negro and translation of Kingsley film.

Internal: Selecting appropriate sojourners out of last school as more potential interns.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum for November as whole nation gears down for elections. (Week 1)*

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: The reconfirmed community council of Sol de Septiembre organizes a celebrative meal and invites representatives from each of the community organizations and ICA to participate. A wonderful informal interchange about the future took place that was all one could hope for in any village. WHO Executive V Council and GAB member Dr. Jose Brogoña visits the House upon his return from Washington, D.C. and talks with us at length about the programs and especially about possible help for he and GAB member Ana Marie Urrutia to go to IERD in India. Letter comes from Minister of Justice giving ICA permission to submit only one Financial Report a year and local travel agent wins again with roundtrip tickets to Venezuela for \$625.

Internal: Two thousand dollars more arrives for use in purchasing house, pushing our S/S model into a closer reality. New Roundtable format is joyfully received - short yet deeply profound - allowing for much easier translation.

Contradiction: Recovering gift of contradiction methods before our contradictions "get" us. (Week 2)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: Sixty-five children participate in second annual Children's Day Festival in Braçaña with games, food and slides on dental hygiene. Development team reaches a total of 100 targets on file to be contacted. House receives the Panchayat and is impacted by history and future strategies workshops.

Internal: House receives first Brazilian volunteer, Roberto Baptista da Silva.

Contradiction: Involving the municipal team in fund raising. (Week 2)*

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: IERD global strikeforce meets and strategizes to reap harvest of delegates from 50 nations. Development planning meeting creates plan for raising new money from Religious Orders. Service Ventures reports September self-support income is in hand or invoiced, October income contracted, November marketing calls begun.

Internal: Jane Sharp arrives and Denise Stanley celebrates 19th birthday. House hosts 17 people during IERD check signals and development Religious Orders planning meeting.

Contradiction: Getting clear quickly on current situation as total body without losing momentum. (Week 3)*

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: Annual Appeal is fast approaching its bottomline with record gift of Rs25,000. This Week II PDL training happens in Bangalore and Bombay in preparation for a month of doing PDLs. Eight hundred and twenty-three participants in 13 RDSs' representing 393 organizations (1). House hosts Sir James Lindsay at dinner during his week of Bombay IERD Development calls and hears an update report on the IERD. New volunteer, Julian Woods, arrives (12).

Internal: House welcomes new volunteer, Vanessa Smith, from England and Barbara Hawley from Global Management Centrum. House fills up as Annual Appeal teams and PDL set-up teams return (1). Collegium on geo-social continent of North America expands global images of House. Friday evening dinner conversation on the victories of the day, 130,000Rs received by development, prompts a spontaneous ice-cream celebration (12).

Contradiction: Trying to protect ourselves from the intrusions of new arenas of demand. Finding new ways to get our priorities done in the light of seemingly competitive deathground bottomlines. (Weeks 1,12)

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: The Nexus moves into a three-guild configuration as planning is completed: Financial Services, Programme Support and Local Development Experiment. Hong Kong Region begins to whirl as R.J. Reynolds gives \$30,000 (US) for Hong Kong Programme work; Local Development Symposium is set up for Nov. 16 and brochure (all inkinded) goes to press. Hilliary Edwards member of London Steering Committee comes to stay for a few days and delights us with descriptions of Area London's project search (for IERD).

Internal: House begins to sparkle as collegium room is painted a-fresh, new decor created, office and guild space recreated and new Internal life two-week rhythm goes into action with two new series of collegiums weekly, one on resurgence in major world religions and the second on the nine continents towards a geo-social spirit analysis.

Contradiction: Ensuring designated nations' participation in the IERD. (Week 4)*

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: LENS International team makes presentations to two prospective clients and ignites sparks of hope for their organizations. Fourteen of the 20 projects selected for US participation in the India IERD plenary have said yes, UNICEF sends \$19,500 to Brussels, seven PDL's have been scheduled, and word was received from Brussels that the size of the US delegation has been expanded. A \$500 check is received from a previously unknown donor as a result of his receipt of the direct mail campaign solicitation letter.

Internal: The Nexus House, Chicago Area House and guests are deeply addressed by the memorial service celebrating the completed life of Wesley Dana Salmon and the celebrative breakfast and conversation following. As the Chicago teachers' strike grinds on into its third week, the Phase I staff seizes the opportunity to catalyze engagement of the emerging generation in a massive recycling effort, a hunger walk that raises \$250 for the Food Depository and a series of Student House service projects. The first of the Week II training tracks series was launched, reaffirming the gift of the Guild configuration experiment and producing a talking paper on religious order rules.

Contradiction: Unformulated winning strategies for fiscal and space management. (Week 3)*

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that the Continental Annual Appeal bottomline is crossed in fourth week of campaign by doubling cash-in-hand in five days and doubling Bombay City bottomline (1). The key contradiction lies in the arena of unformulated command post systems for nurturing regionalized donor base and pursuing new break-opens. (Week 1)*

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports that Indore RDS with 117 registered from 40 organizations mark a new refinement of the interchange method. PDL Command Post decor is up and Operating Systems operational. PDL training in three sites across the continent. The key contradiction lies in the arena of The NSC is experienced as disjoined from undergirding the PDL. (Week 1)*

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports that this week is spent planning for Quarter II out of the context of the year's tasks and working on our space design to sustain us through the year. Conversation with WCDS Indian coordinator James Brown clarifies ICA and WCDS positions and expectations regarding volunteers as well as letter sent to London House. The key contradiction lies in the arena of focusing on individual tasks and reporting rather than corporately deciding priorities. (Week 1)*

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that familiarizing Barbara Hawley with Bombay systems in midst of completing five Houses Summary Charts, September Journal and July and August receipts. The key contradiction lies in the arena of thinking we should be able to maintain the same momentum in midst of doing new training and creating new systems. (Week 1)*
