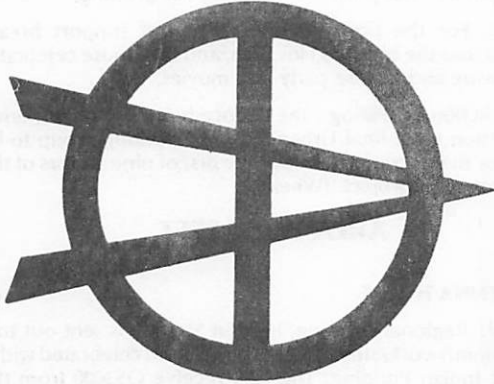

QUARTER III WEEK 5



AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: The IERD National Steering Committee holds its first meeting amidst a busy week of treks during which set up visits are planned for six villages near Sepulveda in the Segorvia province. Steps are discerned for Ariza and Santa Maria de Huerta holds its first neighborhood association meeting.

Internal: Angel our newest volunteer spends every day at the House working on translations. Three Brazilian women brighten the week end as they stop on their way to Portugal's HDTI. A Quantum leaps workshop on Salup Day sends all of our minds racing toward possible next steps.

Contradiction: Keeping the Rural Development Symposium as the central event for the quarter while remembering to use it as the spring board for all other maneuvers. (Week 2)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Work for the HDTI continues on three fronts with recruitment meetings in nine villages, the song book gone to press in the village of Alvite, films from Lisbon, inked supplies and equipment, nine national staff and 11 full-time participants after one week. Facility takes form with shelves, showers and room plans. University at Vila Real comes through with four agricultural professors for HDTI staff, songbook cover, and HDTI excursion site. Virgileo, the cow man, does site visit to Cluster Villages, pledges HDTI assistance with inked visits next week, as well as being on staff.

Internal: Week of the three kings brings special Roundtable celebration, the donation of a bright red TV, the arrival of two Dutch volunteers, Rinus and Tim, two brand-new home-made double beds and a job offer for English teaching from Texas Instruments in Porto.

Contradiction: Closing the deals on materials, participants and cash-in-hand. (Weeks 1)

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: Manpower Service LENS with "Workbase" looks very possible. The NSC of 20 members forms a sub-committee. Dianna Schumacher assures the use of Schumacher Associates resources, with 15 additional contacts also made. Cafod and Christian Aid change old images of the ICA.

Internal: Corporate self-support ventures are initiated and the first maneuver brings 150 pounds. A collegium spurs decor evaluation and activity as sojourners become real team in the second week. In-kind blitz-offer of 8000 pound photo-copier is received.

Contradiction: Immediate demands for staffing work on NSC, RDS, self-support, in-kind activity, intensive week and media critique demand the courage to authentically prioritize and bracket. (Week 4)*

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Time-line through the National Symposium is built with unprecedented realism, courage and commitment. The 1983 study series begins. A spirited Annual Meeting attributed to the Spade-work of former years, interest in the IERD, Volunteer Programme and relevant study programme, plus "high touch" personalized announcements and a famous artist card reminders elicit paid memberships in the French Association of the ICA and volunteers for IERD preparation and participants for study.

Internal: Collegiums on various aspects of last week's check-signals meeting in Brussels are enlivened by the astute questions of Janet Cook, London, who is doing her volunteer sojourn in Paris.

Contradiction: Figuring out the right time and place and asking the right questions to the right people to maximize the momentum of the Annual Board Meeting. (Week 3)*

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

External: Three open houses in twelve days expose 130 people to corporate living and corporate mission. "Stop the world" room (worship room) is the major attention-getter superceding the report of the men's study group. Three "think twice" programs for high schools teach us a lot about Belgians, as well as assisting in self-support.

Internal: Doug Rettig's letter addressing the issues of feminism, women's advancement and the role of men, rocks the House, supplying us with new insight. Letters from Ann Dodge, David Heslop, Jenny Finnigan, Karen Kivimaki, Birgit Ottka, and others suggest that the G.O.R. gets read!

Contradiction: As the Dark Night of the Soul is once again seen through, how do we avoid being blinded by the light? (Week 10)

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Three regional circuits end the first month of '83. Twenty IERD NSC calls, 'Imaginal Education in Frankfurt, Marketing Training in Amsterdam, two Think tTnks on urban futures are set up in Hamburg and Frankfurt. Ground is gained in calls at the diocese offices at Trier and Ludwigshaven-Hemshof with colleagues, the Muisselecks and Phr. Theyshon taking the lead.

Internal: The Frankfurt House participated in prep tasks for the Global Priors Check Signals meeting by sending a team of six while the home team continued space expansion by turning a two-room WW II basement bomb shelter into the E.G. playroom and "House Cafe". Holiday merrymakers include Tracy Longacre and Don, Mary Warren and Don Jr. Moffett, all travelers from North America.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the immediacies so that they enable the strategic objectives to move ahead rather than immediatly undermining the corporate thrust. (Week 3)*

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: As a highlight the House holds a Christmas Open House with 20 guests, featuring slide shows presented by volunteers from Portugal, Egypt, and Kenya. There is a facility search for possible sites for the HD-I and I.E. courses. The House participates in a "Study Day" with other N.G.O.'s in The Hague. The House hosts a five-hour volunteers gathering with five potential volunteers.

Internal: The attic space is renovated with insulation. NRM/NSU context makes the Religious and Vision of society more clear for Volunteers. A "Friesland" circuit debriefing helped to continue building the IERD strategy.

Contradiction: Conflicting time demands of the year end "loose-ends". (Week 12)

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: Quarter III planning of I-2000 Trek design of two-week circuits to 10 major cities to ensure geographical coverage while doing I-2000 interviews.

Internal: Send out Maureen to the GRC in Brussels. Ilona J. and Bill Staples are married in Canada on January 3, 1983.

Contradiction: Setting up systems that co-ordinate the external mission with the internal life, with one effective working person in Rome in order not to fall behind in the quarter's missional thrust. (Week 2)

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

External: The working group on urban housing is surprised during a ten day practicum by projections that 30% of the future work force will probably operate from their homes with computer terminals, demanding a new perspective in urban housing. Top level appointments are set up with W.H.O., for a new round of negotiations. The team working on "youth in development" has project brief ready for printing.

Internal: For the first time this year, self support breaks through into the black by Nov.30th, and the House celebrates with a wine and cheese party and movies.

Contradiction: Creating the procedures and gathering information for a final Urban Housing working group to be ready for the documentation of the first of nine sectors of the urban research project. (Week 8)

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Regional collague, Helmut Slachta, is sent out to a three-month work/study tour in the U.S. and celebrated with a feast of Indian Pudding. The ICA receive OS3000 from the Jesuit comunity.

Internal: first steps in reconstruction of the House are completed with the painting and decorating of the office. The death of a 96-year old neighbor is celebrated with the family.

Contradiction: Seeing through the daily significance of the task to the furturic depth significance of the task. (Week 2)

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: GLS recruitment posters are up and the HCT program launched with the Ford FDND check of LE14,000. Dr. Barkesa of Minia University helps with the survey. Materials arrive from Kenya, USA, and family planning department.

Internal: The Area check-point meeting in Cairo pushes the expansion launch and internal life models.

Contradiction: Unblocking Loc councils participation in Quarter plan. (Week 3)

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: The Quarter planning session generates an in-depth preparation for the Cluster Health Programme. One moter bike finally arrives in the Cluster, allowing one of three teams to have transportation.

Internal: Patricia Allan is assigned to work and gets a job within 24 hours after being assigned.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between planning and implementation that has occurred through lack of training. (Week 1)

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Azombie T/M set of 20 villages in Imo state climaxed by a great assembly with the King and 15 chiefs saying a big yes to the one year follow-up timeline. A team of two Ghanaian Volunteers and Olatungie couple discover they could win the victory.

Internal: Bells return from a three week sojourn in Abidjan to renew their visas in time to celebrate the T/M victory, their 29th wedding anniversary, Owo's 28th birthday, the opening of a new House location in Onlu and the sending out of Micah Amvah back to Ghana after a two months sojourn.

Contradiction: Timing the moves that will create the critical mass toward Human Development in the east while securing permanent visas for the Bells. (Week 11)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Kalundunabwe work-day removes a collapsed roof on the building and the bricks for the roof on the pre-school to prepare for the next Tuesday. CCF visit regarding a proposal to fund each of the 620 preschoolers on a monthly basis is submitted. Cash flow is aided by reestablishing bank overdraft, 359USA in-hand, four cruiser tyres gift, and twenty-five percent discount on photo developing and printing. The government devaluates money by 20%.

Internal: Collegiums on the past Diamond villages, plan and formation strategy for building a movement highlight week. House is kept physically sound by cutting grass/weeds, installing cruiser bearings, and installing locks in corporate spaces.

Contradiction: Reestablishing corporate operation as critical to manifesting the New Religious Mode. (Week2)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: The three Section Houses hold the first Quarter Section Meeting with the presence of the development team assigned from the Nairobi House. At the same time leaders training is going on in each of the Section Houses. Continued monitoring of the Resident IERD committee maintained by letters sent to Zimbabwe. NORAD III is rewritten according to new guide lines.

Internal: The Nairobi House acquires 13 visas for the New Village Movement extra-national staff. Three teams are sent up to sections A,B,C meetings. The House welcomes home Dick Alton and Cody Pinkney from Brussels with Chinese sweet and sour feast on the papered floor of operation post.

Contradiction: Maintaining the edge of the New Village Movement programmatic thrust while keeping support structures functioning across the Nation. (Week 3)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Three hundred and seventy-seven register for the Kabiro Nursery School for this year, while the School Committee braces for even larger primary registration process next week. An invitation extended to active supporters for a Think-Tank on Kabiro's future. The Construction Guild moves into new contract organization with a contract for 20,000 blocks and 200 roofing panels from the coast butchery located right here in Kabiro.

Internal: Sam Were is sent out to teach the twelfth HDTI to be held in Kenya.

Contradiction: Making sure that the reorganization of the School and the construction guilds result in effective engagement rather than bankruptcy. (Week 2)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: The North Tiriki Village Leaders Engagement Meeting has 50 people present. The Kakamega 3 and South Nyanza HDP Site Selection is done.

Internal: The Odari Family and Josephine Nangami are sent out to their new assignments. The demonstration garden is done. In-House Impact Training, Roundtable, and Eight Steps of the Human Journey, signal a new year of being a sign to the villages.

Contradiction: Going through the week using knowledge or skills for implementing our programmes.(Week 2)

NAIROBI-THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: A full House once again as we receive Ngutu auxiliaries, Sharyn Roberts and Daniel Ndolo for the Kaptel VLI and Fiona Knisman.

Internal: We finish the Ngutu consult but fail with the Kaptel VLI, as the Kaptel villagers are invited to dance for President Moi on Jamhun day. Fifty people attend a workday on the Mugumoini community centre (the walls are now 3» high). New development committees are selected in each sub-location of the Muthithi location.

Contradiction: Gathering the picture at the real situation to release the expansion of our programmes to two locations next quarter. (Week 10)

MOMBASA-THE KAMWELINI HOUSE

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY-THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: A visit by a representative of the Dutch government enables old leaders, S. Olatkes, Pundit Uthavun and Punlik Dangere to retell the story of Maliwada.

Internal: The House completes its quarterly planning with a celebration and decides to write one family from Maliwada to join in the weekly Roundtable. Maliwada leaders are taking turns to lead the Ashram collegiums starting with Punlik Dangere, on the Ambassadors Guild.

Contradiction: Articulating the new story that will allow people to participate in the work of Maliwada and the Cluster. (Week 2)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: The Panvel Block Women's workshop sets up a series of Women's Engagement Events through the Block Development officer, a village leader hosts 200 students for a three-day work camp in Chikhale. The Area and Cluster Team hosts the first cluster-wide site visit from the Netherlands Embassy. TISCO (TATA) officials celebrate the victory of the local in an unexpected site visit.

Internal: The Ashram holds a three day planning retreat at AHUJA holiday home, LONAVALA and enjoys bracing mountain air. Vijaya Phadtave addresses 200 students crowded into the ashram collegium room. Makund Bhutpalle joins with the ashram in celebrating his 22nd birthday.

Contradiction: Creating the structures and tactics for releasing maximum creativity to forge the Quarter III mission. (Week 1)

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Medicine for the Vaviharsh Village is received from D.M.O. Nasik, and an authorisation letter comes for the Ghoti P.H.C. service. A film show about family planning and the Castisan village map is submitted to the Environmental Office.

Internal: A daily newspaper for the Ashrams is created.

Contradiction: Dealing with transportation problems in order that the Cluster visit can be on time. (Week 12)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (This is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Establishing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actualization. (Week 5)

PUNE—THE MALE HOUSE

External: Five cement bags are donated by Nap Engineering to the Maale Training Centre. A great meeting is held with Mr. Rathappa Kumbhar, the External Minister, at Ichalkaraiyee on the 23rd of December with the ICA staff and village leaders concerning the Maale irrigation schemes actualization. Mehta and Mehta Company of Kolhepur donates one bicycle to the Maale Ashram for Cluster work.

Internal: The water taker is supplied by L.P. to Maale. Mr. Mukesh Taksadde works with us. Great House celebration is held on the 25th of December with two village guests.

Contradiction: (Week 12)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: A new bicycle is purchased. The circuit model (House to House visit) is put into use. The Health Department promises a film showing for the Cluster village.

Internal: The House enjoys a week of Roundtable, new room cleaning and decor, and the Khirismus festival Celebration.

Contradiction: Pushing the New Auxiliary and followup for "Good Internal Structures". (Week 12)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: A ten day "camp" is held with NSS (National Service Scheme) students coming from Wandha each day, with a massive programme of workdays and cultural activities covering five villages, with major emphasis of drainage, tree planting, blood grouping and toilet construction. Lectures formal and informal are held everyday. A speaking contest is won by a women for Sciene College. The camp, opened on Christmas day is visited by the vice-chancellor (U.S. equivalent is president) of Nagpur University.

Internal: Francis Shrivestwa and Jayapil families are assigned to Christmas/New Year discontinuity, Charles Jago assigned to bakery management and Manami Kitamevas goes to Bombay to extend visa.

Contradiction: Turning new advantage into four sector structural care. (Weeks 12,13)

NAGPUR—THE TEMBURWAHI HOUSE

External: A big week for Commercial Services in Temburwahi as the "Arun Tea and Pan Centre" and "Muoli Kirana Store" are opened. New signboards are painted for the Post Office and Rice Mill and RS46 collected for Gandhi statue. Electrification of street lights in Ranveli and seven irrigation pumps and the Sirci Post Office all sanctioned, as well as the Tubana Animal Pound.

Internal: The Quarter is launched with the arrival of Area Team member Mukesh Taksande who said "Salamat Jalan" with Jakarta GRA collegium. Indian heroes come alive as we name our new enablement teams: Shaetna, Vinoba and Ranilaxmibai.

Contradiction: Using the opportunity of a new quarter to review and adapt our actualization model to sharpen our edge. (Week 1)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: During the Cluster Consult, ten villages are visited, with the Dabhad villagers participating. In Digrus village 45 people took part in a workday. At the end of the Consult a 14 page document was produced in English and Marathi.

Internal: In preparation for the Consult, new lighting and decor are done in the Ashram, and eating utensils are secured. Representatives of the four sectors visits the House during the Consult.

Contradiction: Maintaining village participation during the cotton season. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: The staff of the Royal Netherlands Embassy visits the Sikror and Faridabad Clusters. Goodyear: India Company says yes for funding the Children's playground, while Canara Bank raise their first RS1000.00 for the Cluster. A Faridabad company agrees to donate four tubelights for the Cluster villages.

Internal: The House "Laxmi Bhattacharya and Kay Nixon celebrates the Hindu New Year at the House celebration and party at Mr. Kamath's (A Bank Official) house.

Contradiction: Getting visible miracles in the Cluster quickly while focusing on all the fronts. (Week 2)*

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: The survey map necessary for water development survey is obtained after a protracted campaign in state bureaucracy. Preparation for the Cluster Consult intensifies with visits to other villages. Two women's meetings are held in Gunjurpalyu in preparation for registering Mahila Mandal (government recognised women's group).

Internal: Collegiums are key events, especially the rehearsal of Gram Sabha training and Emerging Generation guidelines.

Contradiction: Working with the government structures when Gunjurpalya and the Cluster Villages are portions of other administrative units. (Week 2)*

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Lipton India (LENS held, December 1982) commits itself to some business with the Bustee Local Committee Women's Sewing Industry to make uniforms for the Lipton factory workers. Two week LENS marketing is initiated with a promising visit to Union Carbide. The House does some fancy foot-work to ensure a great Area Council and Christmas celebration with absolutely no money to do either. The key event of week 12 is a Quarter III calendar session where we decide what not to do in the face of overwhelming opportunities and commitments on all fronts.

Internal: New E.G. curriculum starts with great participation from all House members. Roundtable becomes the spirit highlight of the week. The House celebrates the completion of Area Council in week 12 by beginning a week end of discontinuity with a chicken biryani feast. Sheila Maguire is sent out to the Brussels meeting.

Contradiction: Nailing down programme commitments while ensuring adequate ongoing work with Bustee Industry, education follow up and HDTI preparation. (Weeks 12,1)

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Preparation for the IVAI Board Meeting engenders new thinking through of a statement of our situation. The first development money is deposited into a ICAI Bank account. The creation of two new white board charts and updating of an old one enables tracking of development proposals, visas status, and program set-up.

Internal: The guest bathroom is renovated with a three-color blue paint design, white tiles scrubbed clean, and hanging plants. Horas and Elizabeth Caperton add much needed troop strength.

Contradiction: Contradictory input creates a foggy situation on the best positive moves towards new government agreement. (Week 3)*

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: The House initiates research towards next years proposal to the Government, sends a team on a three-day village circuit, holds conversatins with Kabupten(district) officials, and requests a letter from the Governor authorizing one more year of ICA work in North Sumatera.

Internal: Two people from the House participate in the installation ceremony from the new directoral of Rural Development (Bangdes). John Hichnson visits and discusses the possibility of sending two people to the IERD.

Contradiction: Learning how to see the mandatory Government report and program proposal as key actions in the HDZ, rather than necessary formalities to satisfy Government officials and Donors. (Week 3)*

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: The Think Tank document mailing to participants is completed. ICA board members are debriefed on framing strategy.

Internal: The House sends out Sung Chul to Chicago on re-assignment, three whyte boards are made, and Carling is sent out to Singapore for visa extension. M\$2,500 is received in module fees for self-support. The Roundtable study on Megatrends was attended by five guest participants.

Contradiction: Maintaining a corporate focus for the week's thrust. (Week 3)*

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: Fifty Bontoa villagers attend a meeting in the House called and led by the head man and youth leader to plan a new scheme for village electricity payments. The result is a speedy repair of the generator with dues collected and the return of electricity to the village after a month of 'lanterns'. Forty women attend the 10 day skills training classes in Tankuru village sponsored by the local Government Community Education Department. Four new tyres and tubes for the project vehicle are indinded in Ujung Pandang with the assistance of regional colleague.

Internal: The House attends two celebrations for local Government officers, constructs two new cupboards for bedrooms, learns about Ireland from a collegium led by Kathleen Tonge and watches an English video movie for Roundtable.

Contradiction: Focusing on winning objectives that sustain the corporate spirit and build firm foundations for continuing victories. (Week 1)

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: The second IERD, NSC meeting is held with a workshop looking at vision/contradiction/proposals for rural development in the Philippines. Region begins preparation for a 100 development proposal blitz by feeding cards into the computer while at the same time continuing House training on the computer. The House looks at the options outlined by the Area Council for the next eight years in the Philippines.

Internal: Claudia Cramer returns from Brussels and Zamboanga team from Cebu. The House begins studying Jose Rizals poem's at the Roundtable and discovers a new name for what we have been doing all year 'MUD WRESTLING'.

Contradiction: Strategy required after Brussels "check-signals" meeting on what does Human Development look like in the Philippines in the next ten years? (Week 3)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Moving the ICA office from the second floor of the community centre to the ground floor of village apartment creates a more accessible and usable work space.

Internal: Movie "Mao to Mozart - Isaac Stern in China" gives us a peek into the Chinese soul through the "iens" of Western music.

Contradiction: Building the manoeuvre that will give us a one-quarter plan rather than a list of tasks. (Week 1)

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: The new records are set in development; 17 appointments made with NT\$67,000 (USD21,675) received. The IERD initiating Committee meets to formulate plans for this Quarter. The first draft of IERD materials in Chinese is completed; and Professor Bosco Lee of the National Taiwan University Department of Agriculture Extension comes over to talk about IERD strategy. Control Data Corporation sends their annual donation for US\$2,000. Bill and Gordon return from the Area Hong Kong Council. Rebecca is sent out for a one-month assignment as the staff of Pacific Training School in Tonga.

Internal: House designs its own Quarter III Roundtable and successfully launches same with 15 around the table! John Telford visits from GDC-Hong Kong and celebrates his 46th birthday. Two collegiums on the symbolic dimension of life highlight the week: one on Chinese ritual creation, and the other led by guardian-colleague Bull Wang on "The Proper Way to Make Chinese Tea". Peter Hu Family moves into House and Shao-gan (Mrs. Hu!) is received as sojourner.

Contradiction: Relating next steps in Hai Ou to our IERD strategy. (Weeks 1,2)

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Eighteen appointments for development net 144,000 in hand, Y415,000, Y2,050,000 working and again through Japanese companies visits we have been delivered the imperative to go through the Japanese system to release funds.

Internal: The staff meets Saturday evening from six to 12pm to hear Sandra's report from the Brussels' meeting. Guests are tucked into every nook and cranny of the House, bringing the House population to 27.

Contradiction: Designing new forms and operating structures that break through frozen patterns and images. (Week 3)*

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: An HDZ Lab is held in Sudtonggan. 20 visits are made to public/private agencies in Cebu/Lapu-lapu. We receive five first aid kits fully stocked for five clinics, and promises of help and advice on marketing, bookkeeping systems, and farming techniques for the rock and craft industry and for the farms, all of this during the anniversary of the Patron Saint of Lapu-lapu.

Internal: Four Regions spend five days in Sudtonggan doing the HDZ Lab and using public and private sector sources in Cebu, with J. Telford and C. Cramer arriving to assist. The House preparation includes new decor, utensils and equipment for the Training Center.

Contradiction: Accelerating new program thrusts while maintaining momentum in existing activities. (Week 7)

THE DAVAO HOUSE

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: Development momentum is maintained with 350,000 yen committed for this month, and an opportunity for New Spirit conversations. Designing, making, and addressing New Year's cards rehearses for us the great network we have of Those Who Care.

Internal: Collegiums on development education and East Asia Pacific Development and profound humanness give impact and relate face of ICA work for the training centre residents.

Contradiction: Insuring discontinuity for everyone and still insuring all is cared for and done. (Week 1)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: A five-day residential Global Language School is held for 41 students, hosted by the Korea Methodist women, taught by D. Hutcheons, S. Hamje, M. Jinks and E. Harper and realizing U.S.1100. Lucky (Gold Star) Group confirms its quarterly pledge of US\$1000. The Saemaul Research Department, and Seoul National University ask to print an extensive article on ICA Korea.

Internal: The Yeosu and Cheongwon Cluster staffs leave the village to combine in the Chung-Ju city in-kind facility, with the move symbolized by a Reginal Council which outlines the Cluster circuiting plan and first HDZ moves.

Contradiction: Deciding the right urban project signal without knowing how to get there. (Week 3)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: During the Reginal Council, a big celebration is hosted by the Dong-San church which is near the new ICA house.

Internal: The House moves to Cheong Ju City from Nang-Sung sub-county to initiate the HDZ in Cheong Won County; and holds the Regional Council in its new facility.

Contradiction: Seeing both sides (Yeocheon and Cheong Won) without moving the eye-balls. (Week 2)

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: The Fukuoka Region hosts 37 for Area Council in a mountainside youth hostel in Yahata overlooking one of the world's largest steel plants. A special tour through the plant is arranged by an ICA advisor. The first Board of Directors of ICA Japan, meets in Fukuoka following the Council. Board members are introduced to Regional members and colleagues at a reception following the meeting. Informal festivities include a distinguished business management teacher, Mr. Minagawa, leading the group in a traditional dance of the coal miners. The party continues at a country western pub with singing, dancing and a 12:01 a.m. birthday party for Maxine Butcher.

Internal: A copy machine with paper, soft drinks and UCC coffee are inkinded for the Council. Pre and post Council events fill the House to a joyous over-flowing for several days. Shizuyo Sato celebrates a birthday.

Contradiction: Incorporating regional plans into emerging area strategy. (Weeks 1, 2)*

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: Conversations with the staff of the Osaka Volunteers Association provides a grasp of the "big" picture of volunteer activity in Japan's three largest urban areas. A visit with Mr. Saito, who worked for four years with the Bangledash Committee, finds a colleague with similar experience and interest in rural development.

Internal: Collegiums on the Middle East end with a taped conervation with Miyoko Nakamoto's Iranian friend living in Osaka. The Philippine Work Camp Project is intentionalized by re-imaging the production room into the Project Command Post. The new sojourners move in - Claudia Long and Iwao Omae.

Contradiction: Seeing a variety of Program activities as opportunities for effective collegial engagement and spirit nurture. (Week 4)*

THE SAPPORO HOUSE

External: The House begins a series of 108 (symbolic of Buddhist New Year) visits to course graduates, colleagues and friends, renewing relationships and uncovering several new program possibilities. Yubari colleagues all tell exciting stories about the new image of Yubari as a tourist center with advertising brochures for several new recreation attractions. Newspaper advertisement for Philippine Work Camp yields a flood of potential volunteers ranging from Junior high school students to teachers and nurses.

Internal: The first Roundtable of the year welcomes Machiko back from Academy and Mr. Uchigashima back from two weeks in Delhi, Bombay and Chikahle. The report from Area Council in Fukuoka contexts colleagues on new directions.

Contradiction: Re-focusing and reorganizing our work after the Council and discontinuity. (Week 2)*

AREA SYDNEY

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: IERD calls in Canberra reveal willingness of Aboriginal leadership to participate, in NSC. Sina wows the Tongan community in Sydney, has four scholarships working for the PTS and Peter Ofner signs up to go to Tonga. Ten LENS appointments are set for the coming week i Brisbane and Sydney.

Internal: A two-hour work blitz transforms House and garden. Microconnexions makes \$285 in the first three days of its contract. Cora Das (daughter of sir James Lindsay) delights the House at the Roundtable. The E.G. participate in a pre-Christmas school event.

Contradiction: Orchestrating ten LENS appointments, the Brisbane LENS, the Microconnexions contract, sundry meetings, PTS circuit all with vigour and emphasis. (Week 9)

SYDNEY-THE MURRIN BRIDGE HOUSE

External: Community meeting with government departments confirms plans for agriculture and building maintenance schemes to involve 16 men in work/training for a full school year.

Internal: House sends Margaret Piper to Canberra for a month as part of the "fat cow" self-support maneuver.

Contradiction: Ensuring that the Youth activities come off for the holiday period. (Week 12)

THE PERTH HOUSE

External: Methods for Teamwork is held with 20 around the table, using a construct combining methods, spirit and vocational reflection. Several programme requests for the next Quarter come from the participants.

Internal: The House is enlivened by the presence of Christina Clark and Barry Oakley, and does several collegiums on the Academy, the Training Centre dynamic and IERD.

Contradiction: Keeping the transition momentum going for 4 more weeks. (Week 11)

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Urban Probe focus is shortened by a visit to Prahra Highrise Community Centre and leaders from that centre attending the Roundtable.

Internal: Perth Babara Bellamy comes to Melbourne and gets four job offers in leading Melbourne Hotels, Piano Bass and two nights worth in the first week.

Contradiction: Embodying the needs of three regional teams while planning and setting up for the Area Council. (Week 2)

AREA SUVA

THE APIA HOUSE

External: PTS preparation continues for Suva, Fiji, and Vava'u, Tonga schools. Curriculum for Vava'u is revised to launch 37 village projects in the Vava'u island group of northern Tonga. Twenty Tongan Pacific faculty leave for Vava'u on the boat to prepare the site with 20 gallons of paint and a container load of materials, gestetner machine, decor, and Kazantzakis completely translated into Tongan. 25 faculty-in-training are expected in Vava'u by January 3 to prepare themselves to lead teams and guilds and to get baseline data on the 37 villages. National Radio interviews Fetuu (Star) Tupou on his return from study abroad (Academy).

Internal: High mood of celebration heralds Star's arrival from Chicago Academy in his blue uniform and wearing wedgeblade pin, of which he states, "Now I really understand what this means and what I must do." Star receives his assignment to Suva PTS saying "Why not" and addresses all with his witness to the sign that Tonga must be for the globe.

Contradiction: Finding adequate space to house trainees and staff upon return from the two PTS. (Week 13)

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

External: Marketing breakthrough as the GWF is set for February 26 with a group of Asian women and LENS is set for Pasadena YWCA members at the home of Dr. Marwah in Malibu scheduled for February 5. The RDS continues to spin along with a full-time team on site with visits with a PR firm and funding sources.

Internal: The garage is transformed into the "Carriage House" and the basement becomes "the store" (storage of food items) with an interlude by the E.G. arriving home from the Farmers Market with clams for everyone!

Contradiction: Coordinating "person power" with the mission between two locations relative to the upcoming RDS (the Valley and Los Angeles). (Week 2)

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: Ten local church pastors in the Edmonds ecumenical group are surprised with our report on ICA activities and ask detailed questions about the CSI for April. The Team facilitates a "Consensus Skills" session requested for an Ethnic Heritage Council conference with 40 interested people. The ICA office sends out 45 invitations to the Tulare RDS and completes 25 followup calls with some potential participants emerging.

Internal: Team participates in several around the edges conversations indicating new level of responsibility for team's journey, particularly concerning our "homework" relative to the world of development beyond our own experience.

Contradiction: Risking the facilitation style that moves planning session beyond those which seduce and engage to those which create commitment. (Week 3)*

THE PHOENIX HOUSE

External: The symbolic event of the move into Phase II of Pisinemo HDP, the Pisinemo Small Farms Project Open House, is attended by several other reservation representatives among the approximately 70 people present. The Open House includes presentations of 12 training school participants, RVI representatives, a luncheon feast, and site visits to the 40 acre farm. The House and Area development teams circuit all six metros relative to RDS, VJL, and initiate possibilities with Indian community in Phoenix and Tucson.

Internal: The House rents a Betamax and "The Jazz Singer" and invites the Metro to its first monthly "Movie Night", with 20 enjoying a terrific movie conversation and popcorn. The Youth Cluster mails a quarterly newsletter.

Contradiction: Arranging time for new configuration of teams to get together to make practical decisions amidst heavy demands. (Week 3)

THE DENVER HOUSE

External: Week three is capped off by a fine RS-I course with 17 around the table. Participants are filled with new insights and questions on their own future directions. Three more say yes to exhibits at the RDS in Tulare. The Director of 200 Agriculture Ext. Agents indicates interest in putting together an RS-I in Fort Collins.

Internal: Neibaj Silk continues with a business school while working nights at a retirement home. The House celebrates with Martha Lee Sugg on her 55th year at House Church and claims promises over champagne. The House and Region work together to bring off a great demonstration of corporateness.

Contradiction: Getting so excited about possibilities that we forget wisdom on how to structure events so they become Wedge Blade into the future. (Week 3)*

AREA EDMONTON

THE EDMONTON HOUSE

External: House Teams move on Program Thrusts with large numbers of contacts--sending out 180 newsletters and Alberta Potential Academy brochures to colleagues in three Regions and fifty IERD letters to potential Regional Committee members. Think Tank sponsorship visits continue to computer companies, energy companies and management consultants finding strong interest and another \$200 committed by digital Equipment of Canada. First of APA strategy meetings is held with colleagues volunteering to help market and participate in the courses.

Internal: The wedding of William Stapels and Ilona Jeszenszky is celebrated upon their return to the House with peices of the wedding cake and a rum fruit cake made with ingredients brought from Jamaica by Alice Harriott early in the week.

Contradiction: Creating a transrational model for working as Teams in the midst of individually assigned arenas of responsibility. (Week 1)

THE ANCHORAGE HOUSE

THE VANCOUVER HOUSE

External: A planning session is held with the Mission Chamber of Commerce as a two part series with 30 people representing a good cross section of the community. A Community Forum is held in Port Edward and receives good publicity. A Vocational Journey Lab pilot is held in Vancouver for the Edmonton Area with participants from Edmonton and Seattle Regions present.

Internal: A Halloween party was held in the Co-op. with particular highlights being an apple bobbing contest, story telling by Raymond Tickner and the Pumpkin Pinyata.

Contradiction: Creating the story that releases people from their daily immediacies to come and attend course events. (Weeks 3,4,5)

AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: Regional strategic vision chart becomes a Kaleidoscopic bulletin board featuring "the latest" in each category. Highlights this week being the writing, printing and sending of the Houston-New Orleans bi-regional newsletter, inking of paper and food products for Area Council and the "Third Wave Surfers" (Houston Regional IERD taskforce) decision to visit Asherton for RDS involvement.

Internal: The conversation on Elders lead by Julie Powell captivates 15 around the adult Roundtable while the Emerging Generation Roundtable wrestles with the mysteries in the life of "Encyclopedia Brown". New Teams are inaugurated with a highly competitive kickball game in the local park, followed by a picnic meal.

Contradiction: Effectively synthesizing scattered interchange from the Area and globe to enable the first Area Council of Year to address unfocused mission. (Week 2)

THE DALLAS HOUSE

External: Contacts for Supervisor's training are expanded as five new School District Maintenance Departments are visited, five FAA administrators and three other government managers are registered for a consultation with the US Department of Personnel Services. Letters are sent via the PC to the first 15 prospects for METHODS INC consultations. First Christian Church in Richardson commits \$1200 to the Philippines.

Internal: The Regional Team celebrates the arrival of the Marshalls in Dallas into the first of 10 biweekly research studies focusing on their new book, "The Future of Religion".

Contradiction: Sustaining the strategy that's been launched around METHODS INC by securing adequate information on prospects and programs. (Week 3)

THE MEMPHIS HOUSE

External: This was a week of trips, letters, and troops. We had two development E.T.'s here. There was a trip to an MSU Journalism class, and a Little Rock trip in which an AEH proposal was submitted for \$15,000. The newsletter is written and the Steering Committee letter is sent.

Internal: During this great week the H.S. students had no school for two days, Nancy and Russel made gainway on the carpet, the males of the House made a beer bottle chess set, and David secured a new washing machine for the House.

Contradiction: Clarifying how mountains of possibility get moved when it feels as if we are going in at least three different directions. (Week 2)*

THE ATLANTA HOUSE

External: The Circuit team conducts 6th week Jasper Mills evaluation revealing all the tactics in actuation. The Gibson evaluation meeting is set for March with preliminary indications of substantial progress since Spring 1980. Alan Bingham is sent out to intern in Kenya with a feast at Chichi's in Raleigh N.C.

Internal: Getting outside ourselves by viewing the Gandhi film, marketing computer paradigm, and assisting at Open Door.

Contradiction: Turning new venture, Compuer Paradigm, into functioning self-support vehicle and training ourselves in the marketing and production skills at the same time. (Week 3)*

AREA CHICAGO

THE CHICAGO HOUSE

External: The Chicago House hosts 100 people for the Area Council. A movie conversation after seeing the movie, "Gandhi", helps to appropriate the profound happening it was for us all. Five families announce at House Church their decision to intern.

Internal: The House sends out the Everett and Ruth Lanning family to three months in Africa, Jim Armstrong to his intern year in Africa and the Paula Gayton family to its intern year at Chicago Nexus.

Contradiction: Creating a marketing campaign that builds momentum from our present advantages. (Week 4)*

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE

External: Westport Jr. High administrator, teachers and community people are present at House to launch the plan for School Community Forum. Community Youth join the House youth to expand participation and further implementation of plans for the Youth Symposium. The Metro Team creates a brochure for continuing Ed. Course at UMKC. Four development visits are set and appointments with foundatins being made toward funding the Youth Symposium.

Internal: Jane St. John arrives and serves as master chef for a great Japanese celebration. Audrey O'Boyle spends the night. Sue Barkeony begins a new job at Tiffanys Attic Playhouse restaurant. The men in the House play Paul Bunyan and cut down part of a tree. A budget collegium pushes us toward austerity-lights out!

Contradiction: Coordinating semester finals and big, push on Youth Symposium set-up. (Week 1)

KANSAS CITY—THE LORIMOR HOUSE

External: LuJean Cole, Community Investments Manager for Pioneer Hi-Bred International in Des Moines, will represent Tom Urban, the company's CEO, at the IERD National Steering Committee meeting in Tulare, California February 3-4. The Institute of Public Affairs, affiliated with the University of Iowa says "Yes" to being a participating sponsor for the Mid America: Access to the Future RDS in March. Recent additions to the MAAF steering committee include the Midcrest stake president of the RLDS church, a Nebraska state legislature, an editor of the publication of Farmland Industries, Inc. in Kansas City. A significant nod from the voluntary sector comes as a result of a presentation to 40 plus regional Lions Club officials.

Internal: Lincoln Regional Team members, Terry Uland, Jerry and Annette Hall, and the three Hall children join the House for the Midcrest HDZ Lab, relating Religious House style and human development in a new way; Terry stays on to do house repairs.

Simultaneously, the first of four Student Council Training session is held at a St. Paul Junior High School; a strategy to expand student training on a mass basis. Program marketing and, promotion is beginning in a revolutionary way through Synergrou, Inc., a company which markets technical assistance to businesses.

Internal: Vivian Paul meets with the India Club of the International Center, receives \$352.00, and is invited to present the work of the ICA to other Indian organizations in the Twin Cities.

Contradiction: Creating a unified thrust when we are even more dispersed with program going on day and night. (Week 4)*

THE DETROIT HOUSE

External: The first every **THIRD—WEEKEND—OF—THE—MONTH LENS TUTORIAL** is held packing 42 people into the Training Center's J. W. Mathews Room. Group is exciting and curious: one third new team members and one third mysteriously brand new people. Ten Regional Team members travel to Bangor to participate in an HDZ "highlight" site visit and join 40 Bangor citizens in an initial planning event for the Rural Development Symposium to be held in May during Michigan Week.

Internal: Three intern conversations are held and House members begin imagining necessary and welcomed shifts. A week of Big Thinks and heavy stewing over-eight constructs including the First Force One meeting, the RDS planning event, internal life shifts, Apple III training, Women's Nite Event, Grand Rapids Metro Evening at the Institute and intern conversation formats.

Contradiction: Organizing the operational implications of the Rural Development Symposium being held in May in Michigan -- everything through the eye of the needle. (Weeks 2,3)

CLEVELAND-THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: A Pilot Think Tank on Humanizing Technology is held at King Island with a surprising balance of light fun and profound probing. A five-hour Regional Council follows the Think Tank the morning after, resulting in cohesive tactics on the Mid-America Symposium, Elder Power, and Regional Team Assignments to Mid-North courses, Area, and Continental events.

Internal: Kathy Krause sojourns for a week and produces the Butler Series flyer. Burt Dyson and David Speicher team up to put all mailing lists on the computer including 200 new names. A new Roundtable Rhythm is created to consolidate eventfulness on the "Great Thursday Night of the Month" and the "Great Sunday of the Month."

Contradiction: Restructuring the Metro Core dynamic to pull off Mid-North. (Week 3)

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: The End of Quarter II provides the opportunity for an in-depth, 90-day tactical review and creation of the Quarter III tactical action plan. A McDonald's Team works with the House staff toward the next phase of store training. Paradigm, the computer services venture, starts the Quarter with a long-term contract for the mailing list maintenance with a solid potential for additional work for the same client (no.004).

Internal: The Region tops off a fine series of quarterly planning sessions with a great New Year's Eve party, calling 1982 "The Watershed Year" for the New York Region, signalling the end of a two-year period of "homelessness" and the beginning of a new phase in working with communities and institutions in the Area and the Bi-Region. The House hosts Ann and George Lachman on their way home to Washington State after a stay with the ICA in Lamego, and three Russell Sage College women on their way to the Blue Mountain Cluster project in Jamaica for their interim term.

Contradiction: Integrating and creatively managing the complexity of Task Force work toward a unified thrust. (Week 1)

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: A global film presentation to a women's group at St. John's Episcopal Church of Troy creates opportunities for a development proposal and possible additional film shows. A CYF for Guilderland High School Senior Alternative Experience Program is the first open door for youth programs in recent Albany Metro History. The Teaching Team of Alice Rose, Rocky Sieben and Rienzie Jayasekara is enabled by Susan Brainard and Dick Howie from the Metro.

Internal: A record-breaking January snowfall of 24 1/2 inches brings the first serious winter weather of the season.

Contradiction: Continuing to move interest into program and development commitments. (Week 2)

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: Trek to Norfolk Metro initiates program marketing towards a community planning event in Chincoteague, Virginia. The Regional Team focuses on recruitment of upcoming RS-I and HD-I.

Internal: Procession through the whole facility signals the first Thanksgiving celebration in the new House.

Contradiction: Winning the race against the "Holiday Mindset" by emphasizing eventfulness to do the mission for next five weeks. (Week 8)

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Kevin Grady, Boston Metro colleague, departs for a 16 month Global Odyssey with plans to sojourn in Taiwan, Philippines, Jakarta and India. Paul LeVie and Elsa Bengel meet with Stonehill College to discuss a proposal for a one-week Imaginal Education Teacher's Institute in June. The January update goes out right on schedule.

Internal: Week II is the highlight; includes Friday night at the children's Museum, PSU in Starks on the woodworks, a rehab miracle done on the pantry by the creative cluster, deployment and Marilyn Corcoren's 28th birthday celebration.

Contradiction: Designing our time as a House to corporately prepare for Area Council reports and planning. (Week 3)*

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: IERD follow-up and set-up continues as invitations to the Rural Development Symposium exploratory committee are sent out through the Maine Department Foundation and University of Southern Maine. Starks Enterprises Corporation holds a meeting to discuss implementation (volunteer participation) of the community development block grant received by the town; and another meeting to further plan the writing of The Campaign for Human Development Proposal. The SEC insulates ductwork for the new cornshop furnaces. Woodworks P.S.U further plans legal and marketing maneuvers. Sr. V.P. of CIL offers to sponsor a Development Guild for IERD at the company's expense. An HD-1 is set for the Ontario Metis Association at \$6000. LENS is set with the Native Community Branch, Ministry of Citizenship and Culture, for March.

Internal: A second sojourner this year schedules a February House stay London, England training and a year in India. Chris Halliday, already in the London programme, looks forward to working in Aspitzia early in February. Sharon returns from Brussels with global news. The regular Saturday night team dinner sees Latrobe's India slides and the House regularizes a 9p.m. closing by Elvie Languido.

Contradiction: How to maximize troop use and carry the overload of tasks through imaginal rescheduling. (Week 3)*

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

External: Evenings are given over to quarter planning in which colleagues participate, and which yield an exciting experience of breakthroughs in the external focus and House life. A colleague sets up and hosts two guest dinners signalling first contact and possible program relationship that we've had for a long time with the Francophone community.

Internal: The House catches the excitement of the computer age in doing research on a home computer and its possible applications.

Contradiction: Giving Practical form and focus to the imagined future. (Week 3)*

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: An event filled Roundtable with 12 participants celebrating Ruth Linstead's retirement from fulltime Esso Comany to fulltime volunteer - all looking at the study paper "MACHINE OF THE YEAR" (Computer). The Atlantic Steering Committee looks at strategy for the IERD project selection which allows for two more proposals to be submitted in Montreal and local colleagues send in committed moneis of \$1,000.00.

Internal: The House continues fixing up and getting ready for Area Council with another room painted, one wooden bed made, and two rugs laid. An inkind blitz for Area nets food, beverages and hotel rooms. Ironically the freezer decides the forthcoming load will be overwhelming so it quits on us!

Contradiction: Tying the global to the regional in order to insure the creativity of both. (Week 3)*

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Key visits are made to secure Mexican participation in the HDZ event in Guatemala in March. The House visits the signal economic development project in Tequisquiapan, a rattan furniture factory and sees the local guild, regional marketing team and public-private sector coalition in action. Linda VerNooy secures a new computer contract as the House assists in putting together the proposal. Judy Gilles begins two English classes, bringing the self-support model into operation.

Internal: Jack Gilles leaves for Brussels as the House hosts Linda's parents and Juan and Rosio arrive enroute to El Salvador, delighting the House with the power of the Academy.

Contradiction: Putting wheels under priorities now that new government is in place. (Week 2)

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: The Feast of the Three Kings is celebrated in the village with a Dia del Ninos which includes the graduation of 20 preschoolers into primary school, pinatas, games and a dance. The promotores initiate a new AG training program that includes accounting, marketing and new experimental crops in the parcela. The Roads Department gives long-awaited permission to cross under the highway with the irrigation system.

Internal: House begins the new year with a workday on the residential center with whitewashing, cement and a clean yard creating a demonstration in village living.

Contradiction: Broadening the development base without losing any momentum on the current and working contacts. (Week 3)*

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External The British High Commissioner visits Woburn Lawn to present \$10,000 for dormitory completion for the HDTI and writes a letter of support for our European frame. Preparation for the HDTI moves on with a final curriculum workshop, intense recruitment circuiting and two Woburn Lawn meetings. The National Commercial Bank agrees to a \$500,000US loan from the Inter American Development Bank for a community loan with \$150,000US earmarked for phase 2 of Woburn Lawn.

Internal: We receive 3 U.S., a sojourner from N.Y., send Rob Work to B Meeting and configure into new task forces for school preparation; prefiguring a shift to an Urban-Rural operation.

Contradiction: Pushing onward to launch the HDTI with limited time, while seeking a Kingston facility to maintain our framework. (Week 1)

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: The Region celebrates the completion of DePauw University's two-week project. A total of 3000 patients is seen in 12 communities by the medical/dental team and 60 health caretakers are trained. Phase I of the training center construction (1300 sq. ft. earthquake proof building) is completed. Forty people are recruited for a three-week HDTS beginning in two weeks.

Internal: The House experiences the joy of being a disciplined Religious House again after 40 HDTS participants leave and Judith returns from Brussels.

Contradiction: Designing the structures that maintain Religious House continuity in midst of massive programs which engulf the House. (Week 3)*

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: In Las Minas three signal forums are held one week with four more scheduled for next week. The first Foro in Caracas Barrio of Petore is well received. Exciting workshops on Priorship Training School give us imagery of how we can accelerate the training of Latin Americans in the Order. The "right" three more sojourners join the Order in Barlovento. Barlovento host a site visit from representatives of the British Embassy and Cambridge University. The Bicentennial Town Meeting Campaign moves forward with two Town Meetings down and four scheduled.

Internal: In Las Minas the Fellow year conversations and celebrations of Jacobo and Ramona Pacecho and Tina Valdes. Alfredo Martinez celebrates his 30th birthday. Christmas discontinuity proves to be the pause that refreshes. Barlovento plunges into "Starry Night" "the Prince and the Magician" and the "Creation of the World." The first week of new Solitary office using quotes from Bolivar occasions a great excitement. Juan Jose Osio begins his three month sojourn period and Alfreda Martinez celebrates his 30th birthday.

Contradiction: Discerning significant engagement of order interns as opposed to just engagement. (Weeks 1,2,3)

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: Panaderia buses to the Reservoir for an annual celebration. The Second RS-I paper raises many questions as Sol prepares for the up-coming Foro's. Marino Dizy from Peru GAB visits Sol with many helpful contact names in Santiago for the IERD.

Internal: The Brussels report enables much spinning toward strategy necessary for future.

Contradiction: Creating the strategies and relationships for the future that make possible one cohesive thrust. (Week 3)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: Bracana community finishes the foundation and begins laying bricks on the banana deposit/clinic building. The ICA receives the first contribution of the year-\$500. Margaret Krauss is sent out to Brussels for the Global Priors Meeting.

Internal: Four days of Quarter Planning reveal corporate clarity and unclarity of the next six months.

Contradiction: Beginning implementation of the Quarter in spite of necessary delays in completing the planning process. (Week 1)

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: The Continent is engaged in discerning the necessary event (re/Council) as preparation for participation in January Global meeting and launching the next six months.

Internal: House celebrates Carol Walter's arrival.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from static images re/Council Design. (Week 9)

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: Negotiations are complete on the Sevagram facility for New Skills Training. All centrums are represented at Bombay Area Council.

Internal: The House hosts Kevin Balm, receives Jill Eglund and sends her to the Bombay Area Council the same day.

Contradiction: How to journey the existing quarter plan through the global check signals resolves, so that we have concrete pictures and strategies for the rest of the year. (Week 3)*

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: Two large faculties are finally confirmed for the Tonga and Fiji schools, then disrupted by a reassignment crisis as the Fiji school is postponed at the last moment.

Internal: "Best Ever" New Year's Eve party features 30 guests including 25 young Chinese English students and Elaine Telford's parents from New Zealand.

Contradiction: Ensuring the creation and implementation of those long-range models which will undergird every program and guard fiscal responsibility. (Week 13)

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: Computer training gets representatives from all Centrums oriented to IBM PC's. Brochures for RDS and Program Marketing are in process. Space transformation brings sparkle to public areas and Centrums.

Internal: The House sends out Blase and Roseanne Sands to Area Houston and welcomes Darrell and Sue Marley and their daughter Sara.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with timelined demands when the tendency is to wait for reports from the Brussels Global Priors' and Band Meetings. (Week 2)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

The new IERD concept paper finalized and submitted in support of a world bank proposal. Nine Team spaces identified and initially claimed for more consistent quarter-long operations. Bombay updates programme calendar with tentative assignments while Chicago reconfigurations unifies Programmatic thrust under IERD banner. The key contradiction lies in the arena of meeting immediate demands in midst of reconfiguring the troops and forging the story and systems necessary for a futuristic, corporate thrust.

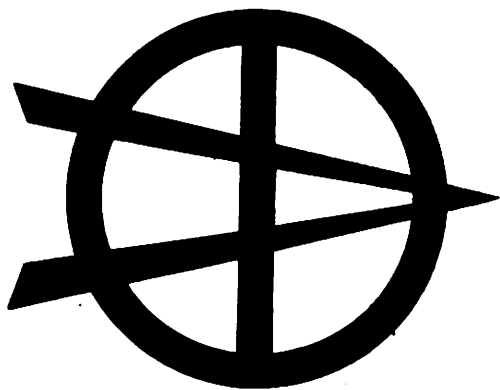
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Appointment is set with King Juan Carlos' sister to discuss IERD participation. Caja de Ahorres promises to print Rural Development Symposium brochure and to check on its progress across Spain for participation in the Symposium. Letters and visits to National Steering Committee members insure their active participation.

Internal: House sends out Barbara, Palva and Franklin to Continental Council in Brussels. Brother Eloy Mecerreyes former Marist Superior from Sevilla pays House a surprise and welcome visit. Two colleagues decide to pay half of our rent for two months.

Contradiction: Finding the key that allows Spaniards to engage in the sojourn program. (Week 4)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: First week of the HDTI closes in the parish center in Cambres with participants from nine villages and four countries, including Eneida and two other Brazilians here to intern for the year. Highlights of the week include guest agricultural engineers from Vila Real University who gave live demonstrations on grape growing, cows, sheep and goats, soil testing, and forrages. An excursion to their demonstration farms in Vila Real ended joyfully with a tour of the Mateus Winery. Weekend Imaginal Education course brings increased participants and puts Portuguese interns up front in workshops.

Internal: House welcomes the Alerdings and Lucy and three Brazilian school participants. Paths cross as Russell returns from Brussels and Paul leaves for Continental Council there.

Contradiction: Meshing school objective of training a Portuguese national staff, focusing on village participants and allowing international participants to participate in a non-translated Portuguese school - all at the same time! (Week 4)*

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: IERD Sub-Committees are inaugurated with meetings this week on location for the RDS. While the Banks are visiting London - Liz contributes great assistance to work on the primary health care frame. Development results in 250p from Barlays Bank and an additional donation from a regular giver.

Internal: The sojourners hit the inkind trail en masse strategy bringing back 20 litres of paint, all necessary brushes, rollers and supplies, 10 room-size carpets (not scraps) and an extra bonus of a sack of chestnuts with the market run.

Contradiction: Running a fine volunteer training event without appearing strained at doing all the necessary deeds. (Week 4)*

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Time-line through the National Symposium is built with unprecedented realism, courage and commitment. The 1983 study series begins. A spirited Annual Meeting attributed to the Spade-work of former years, interest in the IERD, Volunteer Programme and relevant study programme, plus "high touch" personalized announcements and a famous artist card reminders elicit paid memberships in the French Association of the ICA and volunteers for IERD preparation and participants for study.

Internal: Collegiums on various aspects of last week's check-signals meeting in Brussels are enlivened by the astute questions of Janet Cook, London, who is doing her volunteer sojourn in Paris.

Contradiction: Figuring out the right time and place and asking the right questions to the right people to maximize the momentum of the Annual Board Meeting. (Week 3)

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

External: Three open houses in twelve days expose 130 people to corporate living and corporate mission. "Stop the world" room (worship room) is the major attention-getter superceding the report of the men's study group. Three "think twice" programs for high schools teach us a lot about Belgians, as well as assisting in self-support.

Internal: Doug Rettig's letter addressing the issues of feminism, women's advancement and the role of men, rocks the House, supplying us with new insight. Letters from Ann Dodge, David Heslop, Jenny Finnigan, Karen Kivimaki, Birgit Ottka, and others suggest that the G.O.R. gets read!

Contradiction: As the Dark Night of the Soul is once again seen through, how do we avoid being blinded by the light? (Week 10)

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Three regional circuits end the first month of '83. Twenty IERD NSC calls, 'Imaginal Education in Frankfurt, Marketing Training in Amsterdam, two Think tTnks on urban futures are set up in Hamburg and Frankfurt. Ground is gained in calls at the diocese offices at Trier and Ludwigshaven-Hemshof with colleagues, the Muisselecks and Phr. Theyshon taking the lead.

Internal: The Frankfurt House participated in prep tasks for the Global Priors Check Signals meeting by sending a team of six while the home team continued space expansion by turning a two-room WW II basement bomb shelter into the E.G. playroom and "House Cafe". Holiday merrymakers include Tracy Longacre and Don, Mary Warren and Don Jr. Moffett, all travelers from North America.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the immediacies so that they enable the strategic objectives to move ahead rather than immediatly undermining the corporate thrust. (Week 3)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: All day HD-I pedagogy session is held with five Dutch speaking faculty members, two of which are recently returned volunteers, Jan William Rosenboom and Haris Hisman, and two are new faculty members Harri and Hermine Rodenberg (who is on the NSC).

Internal: The week is highlighted by the arrival of three volunteers for training who are welcomed with the electricity being fixed.

Contradiction: Assuming that "6:00 and all is well" when in reality in the midst of missional diversity key tactics are falling though the cracks. (Week 5)*

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: Quarter III planning of I-2000 Trek design of two-week circuits to 10 major cities to ensure geographical coverage while doing I-2000 interviews.

Internal: Send out Maureen to the GRC in Brussels. Ilona J. and Bill Staples are married in Canada on January 3, 1983.

Contradiction: Setting up systems that co-ordinate the external mission with the internal life, with one effective working person in Rome in order not to fall behind in the quarter's missional thrust. (Week 2)

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

External: The working group on urban housing is surprised during a ten day practicum by projections that 30% of the future work force will probably operate from their homes with computer terminals, demanding a new perspective in urban housing. Top level appointments are set up with W.H.O., for a new round of negotiations. The team working on "youth in development" has project brief ready for printing.

Internal: For the first time this year, self support breaks through into the black by Nov.30th, and the House celebrates with a wine and cheese party and movies.

Contradiction: Creating the procedures and gathering information for a final Urban Housing working group to be ready for the documentation of the first of nine sectors of the urban research project. (Week 8)

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Regional colleague, Helmut Slachta, is sent out to a three-month work/study tour in the U.S. and celebrated with a feast of Indian Pudding. The ICA receive OS3000 from the Jesuit community.

Internal: first steps in reconstruction of the House are completed with the painting and decorating of the office. The death of a 96-year old neighbor is celebrated with the family.

Contradiction: Seeing through the daily significance of the task to the futuristic depth significance of the task. (Week 2)

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: First draft of two week Human Development course curriculum is completed. Global Language School is initiated for Government employees. A visit with Head of Governorate Committee for Popular Development pushes "routine" for finalizing government contract one step further.

Internal: David Hicks arrives from England to begin six month volunteer service and Roundtable celebrated by reflections on a variety of Arabic music.

Contradiction: Sustaining three sets of circuits when both trucks are inoperable. (Week 4)*

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: The Quarter planning session generates an in-depth preparation for the Cluster Health Programme. One moter bike finally arrives in the Cluster, allowing one of three teams to have transportation.

Internal: Patricia Allan is assigned to work and gets a job within 24 hours after being assigned.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between planning and implementation that has occurred through lack of training. (Week 1)

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Azombie T/M set of 20 villages in Imo state climaxed by a great assembly with the King and 15 chiefs saying a big yes to the one year follow-up timeline. A team of two Ghanaian Volunteers and Olatungie couple discover they could win the victory.

Internal: Bells return from a three week sojourn in Abidjan to renew their visas in time to celebrate the T/M victory, their 29th wedding anniversary, Owo's 28th birthday, the opening of a new House location in Onlu and the sending out of Micah Amvah back to Ghana after a two months sojourn.

Contradiction: Timing the moves that will create the critical mass toward Human Development in the east while securing permanent visas for the Bells. (Week 11)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Lions Club holds Health Camp at HDTI centre where over 600 patients attend from 20 villages. Development trek to copperbelt returns with Kwacha 861 (USD 757) and 3300 working of three at industry is plastered, ending a two year break in construction.

Internal: House begins to look at implications from the Brussels Priors check and Marge Tomlinson is sent out to Chicago at regional colleagues home after two months of extra ordinary work.

Contradiction: Finding ways to demonstrate viable economic ventures and decision making methods. (Week 4)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Three Kabiro Health Outpost staff (two nurses and one counsellor) teach two-day module to Health Auxiliary Training School in Kamweleni intensifying their consultant role. Seven Nairobi troops sent out on development circuits and to support impact campaigns, consults and government LENS. Bank of America owned Commercial Bank of Africa gives 5,000 Kenyan shillings and agrees to send large proposal to Bank of American Foundation.

Internal: House has five collegiums on Brussels' check signals meeting and its wild implications capped by Saturday night song/skit and game celebration which also celebrates Elisha and Caroline Odari family arrival and Joe Slicker's return.

Contradiction: Keeping feet on the spinning log (especially upright) while shooting the rapids of the next two years. (Week 5)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Three hundred and seventy-seven register for the Kabiro Nursery School for this year, while the School Committee braces for even larger primary registration process next week. An invitation extended to active supporters for a Think-Tank on Kabiro's future. The Construction Guild moves into new contract organization with a contract for 20,000 blocks and 200 roofing panels from the coast butchery located right here in Kabiro.

Internal: Sam Were is sent out to teach the twelfth HDTI to be held in Kenya.

Contradiction: Making sure that the reorganization of the School and the construction guilds result in effective engagement rather than bankruptcy. (Week 2)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Health Training with 132 people from the Section is held in Kangagi Sub-Location. Impact set up in North Tinire prepares 45 villages for VAM. VLEM is held in the South Tiriki location with 47 people who help with circuiting.

Internal: House inkinds supplies, one bundle of soap and two buckets for Section Project directors meeting with representatives from nine projects in the section.

Contradiction: Operating Programmes in the midst of funeral's implementation. (Week 3)*

NAIROBI-THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: Nthagayia Sub-Location says yes to becoming our first Cluster Poject in Embu district. Mugoumoini village is a lively place with a community center workday and a mobile clinic with 360 patients. Business begins for new staff with circuit training and health team getting right on the road.

Internal: New and old staff arrive to begin the Quarter and are impacted by fine shape of the House after three weeks of only two people.

Contradiction: Recreating our self story so that in the midst of being new we have permission to know what we know. (Week 1)*

MOMBASA-THE KAMWELINI HOUSE

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY-THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: A visit by a representative of the Dutch government enables old leaders, S. Olatkes, Pundit Uthavun and Punlik Dangere to retell the story of Maliwada.

Internal: The House completes its quarterly planning with a celebration and decides to write one family from Maliwada to join in the weekly Roundtable. Maliwada leaders are taking turns to lead the Ashram collegiums starting with Punlik Dangere, on the Ambassadors Guild.

Contradiction: Articulating the new story that will allow people to participate in the work of Maliwada and the Cluster. (Week 2)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: The whole House witnesses 26 January (Republic Day) celebration in eight cluster villages and catalyses the distribution of 300 preschool uniforms. Cluster Team and Moho villagers organize Animal Camp enabling the inoculation of 70 cattle. Training Centre Team successfully completes the closing of the land transfer after fourteen months dogged pursuit through bureaucratic mazes. Regional Team circuits to Khambale and Vaviharsh and catalyses a common picture of needed programmes from Mico Co.; Siemeus Corporatina and the Khambale villagers.

Internal: Half the Ashram participates in Area Council in Maliwada. The Phadtare family celebrates its fifth anniversary of marriage at weekly Ritual. House holds conversation on Human-Factor impact of 26 January village celebration.

Contradiction: Building one consensus out of House Quarter III plan and Area Council plan that will enable concerted action. (Week 4)*

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Medicine for the Vaviharsh Village is received from D.M.O. Nasik, and an authorisation letter comes for the Ghoti P.H.C. service. A film show about family planning and the Castisan village map is submitted to the Environmental Office.

Internal: A daily newspaper for the Ashrams is created.

Contradiction: Dealing with transportation problems in order that the Cluster visit can be on time. (Week 12)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (This is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Establishing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actuation. (Week 5)

PUNE—THE MALE HOUSE

External: Five cement bags are donated by Nap Engineering to the Maale Training Centre. A great meeting is held with Mr. Rathappa Kumbhar, the External Minister, at Ichalkaraiyee on the 23rd of December with the ICA staff and village leaders concerning the Maale irrigation schemes actuation. Mehta and Mehta Company of Kolhepur donates one bicycle to the Maale Ashram for Cluster work.

Internal: The water taker is supplied by L.P. to Maale. Mr. Mukesh Taksadde works with us. Great House celebration is held on the 25th of December with two village guests.

Contradiction: (Week 12)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: A new bicycle is purchased. The circuit model (House to House visit) is put into use. The Health Department promises a film showing for the Cluster village.

Internal: The House enjoys a week of Roundtable, new room cleaning and decor, and the Khirismus festival Celebration.

Contradiction: Pushing the New Auxiliary and followup for "Good Internal Structures". (Week 12)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: Two great women's meetings are held, creating three-month plans in Cluster villages of Karenjo-Kaji and Bhankheda. Social survey and electricity survey completed for all Cluster villages. Sevagram Sarpanch promises to get mason to finish drainage begun by workday.

Internal: House celebrates 33rd Republic Day, January 26, with formal debates. Collegiums include witness training and report on Area Council in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Recreating images of self-sustaining local industry. (Week 4)*

NAGPUR—THE TEMBURWAHI HOUSE

External: Tembhurwahi becomes the sports-talk of the district as 62 teams compete for Rs 1, 206 total prizes in three-day Kabbidly Tournament. Neighborhood spirit is revitalized as new Stake Actuation Module plans shramdams around evening fires and newly painted cluster signboard is erected. In the Cluster Health Camps immunize 110 children. Impressed with industry shed proposal, Dewada Tile Factory owner Gupta promises 700 roof tiles, and or participation in the Sirpur-Kagazbagar Rotary Club's New Year Celebration sets up site visit by executives of the Birta Subsidiaries Sirpur Paper Mill and sirsilk Rayon.

Internal: Whole Ashram writes corporate letter in "letters to the Globe" collegium, we usher in the New Year with a brainstorm of 27 collegiums for Quarter III and village leader Chaple is Roundtable guest.

Contradiction: Pronouncing absolution on Quarter II and moving decisively on the many possibilities of Quarter III. (Week 13)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: During the Cluster Consult, ten villages are visited, with the Dabhad villagers participating. In Digrus village 45 people took part in a workday. At the end of the Consult a 14 page document was produced in English and Marathi.

Internal: In preparation for the Consult, new lighting and decor are done in the Ashram, and eating utensils are secured. Representatives of the four sectors visits the House during the Consult.

Contradiction: Maintaining village participation during the cotton season. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: The staff of the Royal Netherlands Embassy visits the Sikror and Faridabad Clusters. Goodyear: India Company says yes for funding the Children's playground, while Canara Bank raise their first RS1000.00 for the Cluster. A Faridabad company agrees to donate four tubelights for the Cluster villages.

Internal: The House "Laxmi Bhattacharya and Kay Nixon celebrates the Hindu New Year at the House celebration and party at Mr. Kamath's (A Bank Official) house.

Contradiction: Getting visible miracles in the Cluster quickly while focusing on all the fronts. (Week 2)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Whirlwind Sri Lanka (Colombo Region) trek by multi-cultural ICA quartet secures Sri Lanka's participation in the IERD, symbolized by 18 attending NSC meeting at the Governem't Ministry of Plan Implementation, and by a strong commitment by government organisations and NGO's present to do the necessary preparation to send a delegation to Delhi in February 1984. Forty Gunjurpalya T-shirts sold at Brussels. Check signals meeting, launch village fund with 1500 rupees. Gram Sabha and Shramadam fever grips the Cluster with four Gram Sabhas and two Shramadams in the Cluster Villages, awakening people to the potential of the upcoming Cluster Consult.

Internal: House life continues to be in a state of fruitful transition, with the restructuring of the kitchen, a birthday, a relative's visit, and a telegram from two volunteers offering their help to Gunjurpalya.

Contradiction: Securing a highly visible economic sign in the Cluster. (Week 4)*

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Two Imaginal Education courses at Serotto Teachers' Center with over 100 participants generate interest in Bustee work. Mr. Upadya, Principal of J.J. Agemera, visits House. First order of 9000 plastic bags is completed and delivered.

Internal: Following a week of late night working House celebrates Manoj Prasad's eighth birthday with the Regional Team.

Contradiction: Ensuring the common mind in midst of many foci. (Week 4)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Sixty people from 15 nations participated in the Jakarta GRA, the first in this two year series, which opened with the Chairman and the Vice Chairman of the Board of ICA. Indonesia present and Professor Selo Sumarja, advisor to the president, giving the opening address. The Assembly was punctuated by two signal plenaries and two great celebrations--a disco and a sate feast. The Jakarta Think Tank results were mailed out; proposals for a total of US\$56,000 were submitted; and Jakarta Region hosted an area meeting on our government agreement relative to our work in Indonesia.

Internal: Another Global Language School gets underway a scant 36 hours after the request is made. The Panchayat does a collegium on HDZ in Latin America, North America and India.

Contradiction: Creating a model for how to keep programmatic activity going during Quarter III in an area and region during assignments to GLS in Surabaya, Pacific Training School, covering Medan priorship and working on the government agreement. (Week 11)*

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: The House initiates research towards next years proposal to the Government, sends a team on a three-day village circuit, holds conversations with Kabupten(district) officials, and requests a letter from the Governor authorizing one more year of ICA work in North Sumatera.

Internal: Two people from the House participate in the installation ceremony from the new directoral of Rural Development (Bangdes). John Hichnson visits and discusses the possibility of sending two people to the IERD.

Contradiction: Learning how to see the mandatory Government report and program proposal as key actions in the HDZ, rather than necessary formalities to satisfy Government officials and Donors. (Week 3)

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: The Think Tank document mailing to participants is completed. ICA board members are debriefed on framing strategy.

Internal: The House sends out Sung Chul to Chicago on re-assignment, three whyte boards are made, and Carling is sent out to Singapore for visa extension. M\$2,500 is received in module fees for self-support. The Roundtable study on Megatrends was attended by five guest participants.

Contradiction: Maintaining a corporate focus for the week's thrust. (Week 3)

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: Fifty Bontoa villagers attend a meeting in the House called and led by the head man and youth leader to plan a new scheme for village electricity payments. The result is a speedy repair of the generator with dues collected and the return of electricity to the village after a month of 'lanterns'. Forty women attend the 10 day skills training classes in Tankuru village sponsored by the local Government Community Education Department. Four new tyres and tubes for the project vehicle are indinded in Ujung Pandang with the assistance of regional colleague.

Internal: The House attends two celebrations for local Government officers, constructs two new cupboards for bedrooms, learns about Ireland from a collegium led by Kathleen Tonge and watches an English video movie for Roundtable.

Contradiction: Focusing on winning objectives that sustain the corporate spirit and build firm foundations for continuing victories. (Week 1)

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: House Journey's through "Ten Days in the Void" looking at national planning for Quarters III and IV. The third NSC meeting held where a list of other groups and agencies are laid before us for possible field visits and screen to look at significant project. Computer expertise allows 20 development letters to be produced ready for mailing in half the usual time.

Internal: Jailu Vergara and Jesse Navarette complete the first part of their wedding ceremony with a civil wedding in Naga city, religious ceremony planned for later in the Quarter.

Contradiction: Finding opportunity on top of opportunity strangely resembling sharks in the bath tub. (Weeks 1,4)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: After many years of visiting Hong Kong's richest Indian family we receive personal cheque which is our first contribution in support of IERD.

Internal: House welcomes the arrival of the David and Sook Ja Lee Hutcheons family and celebrates with champaign at Roundtable

Contradiction: Creating the necessary authorization plan to launch and preparations for the Local Development Symposium. (Week 5)*

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: A team of five (three House, one Development Centrum, one Regional Colleague) go on week long Kaohsiung Region trek--visiting government officials, university contacts, old colleagues, holding a meeting with Hai Ou village leadership, doing presentation and demo workshop for company, and making 15 development calls. This nets three yesses for local IERD Advisory Board, one strong working LENS with General Instrument Micro Electronics, potential program with social agencies in Kaohsiung and Taichung, and learns that Hai Ou has already raised its portion (150,000NT) of recently announced government grant.

Internal: John Telford helps us do 30 development calls in two weeks, David and Suk Ja Lee Hutcheons drop in on way to Nam Wai and do great collegium on Korea, and the Roundtable overflows with guests.

Contradiction: Preparing ourselves with adequate context and homework for IERD visits with sharp, top-level government officials. (Weeks 3,4)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Eighteen appointments for development net 144,000 in hand, Y415,000, Y2,050,000 working and again through Japanese companies visits we have been delivered the imperative to go through the Japanese system to release funds.

Internal: The staff meets Saturday evening from six to 12pm to hear Sandra's report from the Brussels' meeting. Guests are tucked into every nook and cranny of the House, bringing the House population to 27.

Contradiction: Designing new forms and operating structures that break through frozen patterns and images. (Week 3)

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: Zamboangu Consult training begins with feast in Skyvue restaurant for 21 participants. Economic Team plants 200 ampalaya plants and organizes a Mactan farmers guild.

Internal: Two interns from Mactan are assigned; one to Cebu House and one to the Zamboangu House.

Contradiction: Using time and people to enable and motivate the new vision of Mactan 24 program. (Week 2)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: Development momentum is maintained with 350,000 yen committed for this month, and an opportunity for New Spirit conversations. Designing, making, and addressing New Year's cards rehearses for us the great network we have of Those Who Care.

Internal: Collegiums on development education and East Asia Pacific Development and profound humanness give impact and relate face of ICA work for the training centre residents.

Contradiction: Insuring discontinuity for everyone and still insuring all is cared for and done. (Week 1)

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Industrial company oil spill damage compensation for cluster village shellfish is resolved in unprecedented single meeting, with villagers and company both crediting their existing relationship as human development project partners. IERD prep continues with visits to Ministry of Home Affairs and Global Board Advisor, firm scheduling of Rural Development Symposia, and draft of official letter of invitation to the Korean government.

Internal: David and Sook Ja Hutcheons are sent out to new assignment in Nam Wai after three and one-half years in Area Tokyo including every project site (four) in Korea. New internal life design moves family night and Roundtable and includes folk dancing on Saturday night.

Contradiction: dFixing local IERD images while global images remain vague and uncharted. (Week 4)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: House participates in IERD planning meeting in Seoul, sends four people off to Yeosu for first Cluster circuit, and visits the four villages in the Cheong Won Cluster.

Internal: House participates in John Han San Schwobel's 100 day celebration and continues work on new facility.

Contradiction: Clarifying the HDZ task in the midst of the many tasks. (Week 3)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: The Fukuoka Region hosts 37 for Area Council in a mountainside youth hostel in Yahata overlooking one of the world's largest steel plants. A special tour through the plant is arranged by an ICA advisor. The first Board of Directors of ICA Japan, meets in Fukuoka following the Council. Board members are introduced to Regional members and colleagues at a reception following the meeting. Informal festivities include a distinguished business management teacher, Mr. Minagawa, leading the group in a traditional dance of the coal miners. The party continues at a country western pub with singing, dancing and a 12:01 a.m. birthday party for Maxine Butcher.

Internal: A copy machine with paper, soft drinks and UCC coffee are inkinded for the Council. Pre and post Council events fill the House to a joyous over-flowing for several days. Shizuyo Sato celebrates a birthday.

Contradiction: Incorporating regional plans into emerging area strategy. (Weeks 1, 2)

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: Members of the Regional Team gather with the Area to look at the next five years and plan specific tasks. Highlights were shared responsibility of leadership roles, a trip to Shin-nittetsu (Nippon Steel), celebration of the year of the boar, and the morning spins. Don Hinkelman stops by to meet Ms. Morita and plan Philippine Work Camp next steps. A colleague student shows excitement at the prospect of a year in a developing country.

Internal: House members scatter to a variety of holiday activities: an Oshogatsu visit with Mrs. Yshikaea's family, a visit to Mount Aso, seeing Tron and superman II.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between the area meeting recommendations and the numerous local tasks already in motion. (Week 1)*

THE SAPPORO HOUSE

External: Government sponsored Town Meeting circuit in Aomori Prefecture has a new image as ICA staff is driven from one town to another in black limosenes. We are received by mayors and planning groups as community consultants, and work with them on specific issues. Machiko Horuichi gets paid writer's fee for publicizing ICA programs in the newspaper.

Internal: Mr. Uchigashima gives exciting report on his trip to Indian Houses and Chikhale project. He wears longi and Karta, and serves Indian tea while showing slides and telling the story.

Contradiction: Being patient as program directors come into focus but aren't yet clear enough to timeline the details. (Week 4)*

AREA SYDNEY

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: Eleven appointments set for LENS and Development Blitz. Entire House travels to Melbourne for fine Area Council where our reconfiguration of houses is revealed as a powerful tool for total Area care and empowerment of Catalytic Cities experiment.

Internal: Final three days of "Fat Cow" self-support maneuver in a flurry of activity. Second Computer Venture contract is secured and first job done. E.G. send out House to Area Council with a fine recorder concert. Jenny Robins is enrolled in school and Don Baker gets his U.S. Visa (finally!).

Contradiction: Quickly putting regional wheels under Area plans for the next six months. (Week 4)*

SYDNEY-THE MURRIN BRIDGE HOUSE

External: Community meeting with government departments confirms plans for agriculture and building maintenance schemes to involve 16 men in work/training for a full school year.

Internal: House sends Margaret Piper to Canberra for a month as part of the "fat cow" self-support maneuver.

Contradiction: Ensuring that the Youth activities come off for the holiday period. (Week 12)

THE PERTH HOUSE

External: Methods for Teamwork is held with 20 around the table, using a construct combining methods, spirit and vocational reflection. Several programme requests for the next Quarter come from the participants.

Internal: The House is enlivened by the presence of Christina Clark and Barry Oakley, and does several collegiums on the Academy, the Training Centre dynamic and IERD.

Contradiction: Keeping the transition momentum going for 4 more weeks. (Week 11)

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Urban Probe focus is shortened by a visit to Prahran Highrise Community Centre and leaders from that centre attending the Roundtable.

Internal: Perth Babara Bellamy comes to Melbourne and gets four job offers in leading Melbourne Hotels, Piano Bass and two nights worth in the first week.

Contradiction: Embodying the needs of three regional teams while planning and setting up for the Area Council. (Week 2)

AREA SUVA

THE APIA HOUSE

External: PTS preparation continues for Suva, Fiji, and Vava'u, Tonga schools. Curriculum for Vava'u is revised to launch 37 village projects in the Vava'u island group of northern Tonga. Twenty Tongan Pacific faculty leave for Vava'u on the boat to prepare the site with 20 gallons of paint and a container load of materials, gestetner machine, decor, and Kazantzakis completely translated into Tongan. 25 faculty-in-training are expected in Vava'u by January 3 to prepare themselves to lead teams and guilds and to get baseline data on the 37 villages. National Radio interviews Fetuu (Star) Tupou on his return from study abroad (Academy).

Internal: High mood of celebration heralds Star's arrival from Chicago Academy in his blue uniform and wearing wedgeblade pin, of which he states, "Now I really understand what this means and what I must do." Star receives his assignment to Suva PTS saying "Why not" and addresses all with his witness to the sign that Tonga must be for the globe.

Contradiction: Finding adequate space to house trainees and staff upon return from the two PTS. (Week 13)

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

External: Kaypro promises three portable micro-computers for use at RDS. All 32 booths at Symposium are reserved and housing is secured for 20 people. VJL recruitment trip happens in San Francisco.

Internal: Marilyn Oyler and Sandra Tru arrive to help set up RDS, and Esther Cannon gets assigned to bed with two broken bones in her ankle.

Contradiction: Using Area Council for depth reflection on what it means to grasp the next 18 months as an opportunity to push the edge of our corporate mission. (Week 4)*

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: A Roundtable with more new people finds practical work doing collective research on world development trends a helpful pull-together of the research so far. A Team planning day does wave analysis on trends of history, reflects on strategy and commitment through the movie of GANDHI and engages in significant conversation about the remaining task of the program year. GANDHI addresses all as a profound encounter with life of surrender, freedom and commitment, and empowers poetry of the day during the planning task.

Internal: A visit of Carin, Aaron and Jason Boone for three days while Carin attends the Physicians Assistants Conference for continuing education credit, stretches child care practices.

Contradiction: Keeping courage to stay at the depth achieved during Saturday planning. (Week 4)*

THE PHOENIX HOUSE

External: The region meets to plan Quarter III, and celebrate the visit of Kim and Chris Epley on their way to Guatemala. The two-day circuit of the Tucson Metro includes the first of possibly eight two-hour Imaginal Education workshops with Lutheran Elementary School; three more RDS displays and confirmation of fourth NSC member from region. Internal: Self-support moves ahead as Nina receives first Baskin-Robbins paycheck and House is hired to do property maintenance while John McAdam and Nathan's room is completed and Don Barkoney moves into "rear condominium" for a week.

Contradiction: Creating a consensus on task priorities and configurations. (Week 2)*

THE DENVER HOUSE

Afternoon forum scheduled with Fellou School staff as program needs become clearer through meeting with Wighland neighborhood and Teller School. Funding proposal for three Denver neighborhood programs move toward final draft and submittal while six troops are assigned to Area Council.

Internal: Olive Anne Slotta joins the Day I staff and Larry Hamje is accepted to School of miners.

Contradiction: Making sure the fields get ploughed, barn get cleaned and neighbours get invitations while the farmer and his wife are in the big city and the California Farm. (Week 5)*

AREA EDMONTON

THE EDMONTON HOUSE

External: The continuation of Alberta Potential Academy visits and recruitment highlights the week with visits to Franciscan sisters and eight churches. IERD meeting was held in Edmonton with eight in attendance.

Internal: A successful Area Council was highlighted by the movie Gandhi and an Indian dinner celebration

Contradiction: Building the maneuver which will release program and recruitment bottom line. (Week 4)*

THE ANCHORAGE HOUSE

THE VANCOUVER HOUSE

External: A planning session is held with the Mission Chamber of Commerce as a two part series with 30 people representing a good cross section of the community. A Community Forum is held in Port Edward and receives good publicity. A Vocational Journey Lab pilot is held in Vancouver for the Edmonton Area with participants from Edmonton and Seattle Regions present.

Internal: A Halloween party was held in the Co-op. with particular highlights being an apple bobbing contest, story telling by Raymond Tickner and the Pumpkin Pinyata.

Contradiction: Creating the story that releases people from their daily immediacies to come and attend course events. (Weeks 3,4,5)

AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: House hosts Mary Keegan of the Delegation of Friendship Among Women and guests to hear about the Delegation's trip to India and see slides of, among other projects, Chikhale. "Smashing", on-target Metro meeting conversation on loneliness and a workshop on other organizations releases responsibility for establishing links with other groups, intensified regional communications and Vocational Journey Lab sponsorship.

Internal: Sands family received with great excitement. Their arrival heralded by installation of new floor by Metro Church Team and corporate room painting blitz.

Contradiction: How to hold the tension between necessary two-year visioning relative to IERD work and building the detailed plan that is necessary in a three-session Area Council that is the first of this program year. (Week 3)*

THE DALLAS HOUSE

External: Methods, Inc. goes for broke with a team marketing effort of 56 marketing telephone calls, 17 letters, two visits and seven appointments set for next week. Training and production keep the PC hot all week.

Internal: First Team study of Marshall book "Future of Religion" pushes us beyond the situation we're in and quickly reveals the depth of the struggle to articulate the new form of spirit consciousness.

THE CHICAGO HOUSE

External: Fifth city Business Careers graduated the 11th class, with daughters of Ruth Carter, Nola Ross, and Rosemary Medius graduating. Karen Barnes, Lela Mosely's daughter joins the staff and Cecil Partee, City Treasurer, is the speaker. Four regional people attended the MAAF (Midwest Access to America conferne) in Des Moines.

Internal: Jim Armstrong, House sojourner for a month, led us in a sample Progoff Journal writing session. He is finishing at Loyola University his doctoral thesis on Progoff's theory and method.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the recruitment of major events in a relatively short period of time. (Week 5)*

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE

External: Recruitment continues with 200 units for Youth Symposium and phone calls made confirming 60 registrants. Westport Alive Steering Committee spends exciting eve signing, stuffing and sealing 1800 letters/envelopes, inkind continues.

Internal: Juliet receives acceptance at Kansas University and House experiences fine Roundtable conversation on books.

Contradiction: Articulating and rehearsing the absolutism that gives life in the midst of experiencing radical accountability. (Week 5)*

KANSAS CITY—THE LORIMOR HOUSE

Contradiction: Catching the wind and sailing with innovative program and broad self-support. (Week 5)*

THE DETROIT HOUSE

External: The first every THIRD—WEEKEND—OF—THE—MONTH LENS TUTORIAL is held packing 42 people into the Training Center's J. W. Mathews Room. Group is exciting and curious: one third new team members and one third mysteriously brand new people. Ten Regional Team members travel to Bangor to participate in an HDZ "highlight" site visit and join 40 Bangor citizens in an initial planning event for the Rural Development Symposium to be held in May during Michigan Week.

Internal: Three intern conversations are held and House members begin imagining necessary and welcomed shifts. A week of Big Thinks and heavy stewing over-eight constructs including the First Force One meeting, the RDS planning event, internal life shifts, Apple III training, Women's Nite Event, Grand Rapids Metro Evening at the Institute and intern conversation formats.

Contradiction: Organizing the operational implications of the Rural Development Symposium being held in May in Michigan -- everything through the eye of the needle. (Weeks 2,3)

CLEVELAND-THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: A Pilot Think Tank on Humanizing Technology is held at King Island with a surprising balance of light fun and profound probing. A five-hour Regional Council follows the Think Tank the morning after, resulting in cohesive tactics on the Mid-America Symposium, Elder Power, and Regional Team Assignments to Mid-North courses, Area, and Continental events.

Internal: Kathy Krause sojourns for a week and produces the Butler Series flyer. Burt Dyson and David Speicher team up to put all mailing lists on the computer including 200 new names. A new Roundtable Rhythm is created to consolidate eventfulness on the "Great Thursday Night of the Month" and the "Great Sunday of the Month."

Contradiction: Restructuring the Metro Core dynamic to pull off Mid-North. (Week 3)

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: Effective Leadership course begins with Tenant's Association in Morristown, New Jersey. Task Forces do mid-quarter remaneuvering.

Internal: House and Region join together to complete Ventures office space, paint collegium room ceiling in anticipation of Joan Secord's 60th birthday party.

Contradiction: Redeciding priorities given the new demands created at Area Council. (Week 5)*

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: A global film presentation to a women's group at St. John's Episcopal Church of Troy creates opportunities for a development proposal and possible additional film shows. A CYF for Guilderland High School Senior Alternative Experience Program is the first open door for youth programs in recent Albany Metro History. The Teaching Team of Alice Rose, Rocky Sieben and Rienzie Jayasekara is enabled by Susan Brainard and Dick Howie from the Metro.

Internal: A record-breaking January snowfall of 24 1/2 inches brings the first serious winter weather of the season.

Contradiction: Continuing to move interest into program and development commitments. (Week 2)

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: Trek to Norfolk Metro initiates program marketing towards a community planning event in Chincoteague, Virginia. The Regional Team focuses on recruitment of upcoming RS-I and HD-I.

Internal: Procession through the whole facility signals the first Thanksgiving celebration in the new House.

Contradiction: Winning the race against the "Holiday Mindset" by emphasizing eventfulness to do the mission for next five weeks. (Week 8)

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Kevin Grady, Boston Metro colleague, departs for a 16 month Global Odyssey with plans to sojourn in Taiwan, Philippines, Jakarta and India. Paul LeVie and Elsa Bengel meet with Stonehill College to discuss a proposal for a one-week Imaginal Education Teacher's Institute in June. The January update goes out right on schedule.

Internal: Week II is the highlight; includes Friday night at the children's Museum, PSU in Starks on the woodworks, a rehab miracle done on the pantry by the creative cluster, development and Marilyn Corcoren's 28th birthday celebration.

Contradiction: Designing our time as a House to corporately prepare for Area Council reports and planning. (Week 3)

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: Starks Woodworks samples for magazine racks are done and balance sheets and income statements are current. With help from our colleague Joyce Benson in the state planning office, the campaign for Human Development proposal is submitted for further building rehab (the cornshop) and sewage.

Contradiction: Weaving Regional Advantages into an unified campaign strategy for the province. (Week 5)*

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

External: Evenings are given over to quarter planning in which colleagues participate, and which yield an exciting experience of breakthroughs in the external focus and House life. A colleague sets up and hosts two guest dinners signalling first contact and possible program relationship that we've had for a long time with the Francophone community.

Internal: The House catches the excitement of the computer age in doing research on a home computer and its possible applications.

Contradiction: Giving Practical form and focus to the imagined future. (Week 3)

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: VJL notices go up in the Universities across Montreal and final documentation is sent to Ottawa for Jamaica CICA grant.

Internal: Week of celebrating with multi-ethnic 18th birthday party of Kristen Cramer rocks the House in fine style until the crack of dawn. Six months of search over as Doug Allan lands bilingual bookkeeping job close to House and the Fisher family celebrate anniversary by being part of the Metis HD-I in Niagara Falls.

Contradiction: Weaving several strands into one fabric. (Week 5)*

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Week experienced as a rocket launch when TIME/LIFE BOOKS calls us and asks for two LENS as soon as possible. Area development strategy gears up with arrival of Bill Slicker, preparation of Quarter III development tactics and budgets for 83-84.

Internal: Collegiums on Brussels' Priors' Council and Linda VerNooy's trip to Merida in the Yucatan enlarge our vision of the future.

Contradiction: discovering how to move decisively on all fronts when the picture is constantly changing. (Week 4)*

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: The Feast of the Three Kings is celebrated in the village with a Dia del Ninos which includes the graduation of 20 preschoolers into primary school, pinatas, games and a dance. The promoters initiate a new AG training program that includes accounting, marketing and new experimental crops in the parcela. The Roads Department gives long-awaited permission to cross under the highway with the irrigation system.

Internal: House begins the new year with a workday on the residential center with whitewashing, cement and a clean yard creating a demonstration in village living.

Contradiction: Broadening the development base without losing any momentum on the current and working contacts. (Week 3)

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External Staff and ICA Board visit two Cabinet Ministers receiving their support for the HDTI. IDB site-visitor says "I am well impressed" and Spring Arbour College and the Western Hemisphere Conference on Community Development also have good site visits of Woburn Lawn. HDTI opens with 50 participants and 11 Jamaicans on the faculty - from the Ministries of Agriculture, Youth and Education, and Kingston House; the opening was attended by Rotarians with the Director of Planning and Youth as main speaker.

Internal: House reconfigures with new generals emerging and welcomes Nan Grow from GRC for HDTI faculty.

Contradiction: Using this chairotic moment to move boldly in the Second Turn within the world. (Weeks 2,3)*

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: The Region celebrates the completion of DePauw University's two-week project. A total of 3000 patients is seen in 12 communities by the medical/dental team and 60 health caretakers are trained. Phase I of the training center construction (1300 sq. ft. earthquake proof building) is completed. Forty people are recruited for a three-week HDTI beginning in two weeks.

Internal: The House experiences the joy of being a disciplined Religious House again after 40 HDTI participants leave and Judith returns from Brussels.

Contradiction: Designing the structures that maintain Religious House continuity in midst of massive programs which engulf the House. (Week 3)

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: In Caracas 19,000 Bolivars are deposited as Campaign to eradicate debt begins and original government patron joins IERD. Mr. Gutierrez of the Institute of Malariology conducts Barlovento training on topic of parasite control for health workers of the Cluster. The Institute agrees to give talks in each village as the ninth mobilization trek begins a four day visit to Marcelo focusing on health services.

Internal: Gains on Self-support are made as 11 chickens are inkinded from an overturned truck and the marketing of English classes continues.

Contradiction: Relating short term victories to long term strategy. (Week 4)*

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: House sends out an eight person delegation to Peru three-week training school - included is the president of Lampas County-wide Association of Community Associations. Total travel costs kept at a low \$1080(US) by excellent ticket bargaining and the help of the flexibility provided by special approval of visas by the Peruvian Embassy without return tickets. The Lampa Mayor helps with \$200, and the travelers participate fully in fund raising by sponsoring a dance in Sol de Septiembre and going on development viits. Seven people decide to participate in the CICC in Aspetia, Peru and to raise part of their passage funds through visits to donors, a dance, and other means of development. The directors of the "neighborhood organization" in Sol de Septiembre continue their journey of self-sufficiency by forming commissions to deal with the challenges facing their community.

Internal: Studies in Bonhoffer's Freedom paper and the Immense Journey by Easley and our first visit for a new House are all ways of beckoning the 100 interns.

Contradiction: Releasing the teams from the many ambiguities to engage their creativity into finding the solutions to the comprehensive priorities we have identified. (Weeks 4,5)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: Bracana community finishes the foundation and begins laying bricks on the banana deposit/clinic building. The ICA receives the first contribution of the year-\$500. Margaret Krauss is sent out to Brussels for the Global Priors Meeting.

Internal: Four days of Quarter Planning reveal corporate clarity and unclarity of the next six months.

Contradiction: Beginning implementation of the Quarter in spite of necessary delays in completing the planning process. (Week 1)

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: The Continent is engaged in discerning the necessary event (re/Council) as preparation for participation in January Global meeting and launching the next six months.

Internal: House celebrates Carol Walter's arrival.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from static images re/Council Design. (Week 9)

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: National Steering Committee Meeting launches Rythm of subcommittee meetings and six weekly NSC meetings - gearing up for the 1983 countdown to the IERD.

Internal: The Nexus House fills up as development circuits, documentation treks and Priors from Bussels return to spend the Week II in team planning for internal life - food, symbolic, hosting and E.G.

Contradiction: In the midst of the hectic pace and being scattered across the continent; creating a corporate picture of the total task.(Week 4)*

Internal: Event filled House Church welcomes New Zealand guests Dick and Gertie Sargent (Elaine's parents) to share triple celebrations; the Telford Family's anniversary, Elaine's birthday and Michelle's passing university entrance exam.

Contradiction: Actualising in practical forms revolutionary social reconstruction. (Week 2)*

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: IERD Team goes laden with materials to Los Angeles for NSC meeting. VJL team leaves to meet demands of a full Quarter's calendar. \$200,000 contribution arrives in mail.

Internal: Air Traffic Control Board grants appointment to Horizons Unlimited as full-fledged travel agency; event is celebrated with champagne and claiming of promises at House Meeting.

Contradiction: Bringing self-consciousness to a methodology that allows us to decide the immediate thrust of our corporate two-year priorities and designs. (Week 5)*

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Trek to Valladolid unearths a number of possible projects for IERD and solid commitments to a series of GYF's. Barbara and Lucy start trek to Valencia with a three session training course for Jesuit Brothers working with the gypsies. One thousand five hundred copies of IERD cover and 1,000 individual donors forms are printed free of charge from Ibergraficos. Maria Victoria Fernandez of Ministry of Labor joins National Steering Committee and opens up funding possibilities with Ministry.

Internal: Another week of transitions with colleagues returning from Continental Council, others going to Valladolid, others to Valencia and Patrice Vrona to HDTI in Lamego. Lucy continues to charm House with her weekly Spanish class.

Contradiction: Getting the gears meshed that would allow the whole vehicle to move toward the Rural Development Symposium. (Week 5)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: First week of the HDTI closes in the parish center in Cambres with participants from nine villages and four countries, including Eneida and two other Brazilians here to intern for the year. Highlights of the week include guest agricultural engineers from Vila Real University who gave live demonstrations on grape growing, cows, sheep and goats, soil testing, and forrages. An excursion to their demonstration farms in Vila Real ended joyfully with a tour of the Mateus Winery. Weekend Imaginal Education course brings increased participants and puts Portuguese interns up front in workshops.

Internal: House welcomes the Alerdings and Lucy and three Brazilian school participants. Paths cross as Russell returns from Brussels and Paul leaves for Continental Council there.

Contradiction: Meshing school objective of training a Portuguese national staff, focusing on village participants and allowing international participants to participate in a non-translated Portuguese school - all at the same time! (Week 4)

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: IERD Sub-Committees are inaugurated with meetings this week on location for the RDS. While the Banks are visiting London - Liz contributes great assistance to work on the primary health care frame. Development results in 250p from Barlays Bank and an additional donation from a regular giver.

Internal: The sojourners hit the inkind trail en masse strategy bringing back 20 litres of paint, all necessary brushes, rollers and supplies, 10 room-size carpets (not scraps) and an extra bonus of a sack of chestnuts with the market run.

Contradiction: Running a fine volunteer training event without appearing strained at doing all the necessary deeds. (Week 4)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Time-line through the National Symposium is built with unprecedented realism, courage and commitment. The 1983 study series begins. A spirited Annual Meeting attributed to the Spade-work of former years, interest in the IERD, Volunteer Programme and relevant study programme, plus "high touch" personalized announcements and a famous artist card reminders elicit paid memberships in the French Association of the ICA and volunteers for IERD preparation and participants for study.

Internal: Collegiums on various aspects of last week's check-signals meeting in Brussels are enlivened by the astute questions of Janet Cook, London, who is doing her volunteer sojourn in Paris.

Contradiction: Figuring out the right time and place and asking the right questions to the right people to maximize the momentum of the Annual Board Meeting. (Week 3)

THE BRUSSELS HOUSE

External: Three open houses in twelve days expose 130 people to corporate living and corporate mission. "Stop the world" room (worship room) is the major attention-getter superceding the report of the men's study group. Three "think twice" programs for high schools teach us a lot about Belgians, as well as assisting in self-support.

Internal: Doug Rettig's letter addressing the issues of feminism, women's advancement and the role of men, rocks the House, supplying us with new insight. Letters from Ann Dodge, David Heslop, Jenny Finnigan, Karen Kivimaki, Birgit Ottka, and others suggest that the G.O.R. gets read!

Contradiction: As the Dark Night of the Soul is once again seen through, how do we avoid being blinded by the light? (Week 10)

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Three regional circuits end the first month of '83. Twenty IERD NSC calls, 'Imaginal Education in Frankfurt, Marketing Training in Amsterdam, two Think tTnks on urban futures are set up in Hamburg and Frankfurt. Ground is gained in calls at the diosecean offices at Trier and Ludwigshaven-Hemshof with colleagues, the Muisselecks and Phr. Theyshon taking the lead.

Internal: The Frankfurt House participated in prep tasks for the Global Priors Check Signals meeting by sending a team of six while the home team continued space expansion by turning a two-room WW II basement bomb shelter into the E.G. playroom and "House Cafe". Holiday merrymakers include Tracy Longacre and Don, Mary Warren and Don Jr. Moffett, all travelers from North America.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the immediacies so that they enable the strategic objectives to move ahead rather than immediatly undermining the corporate thrust. (Week 3)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: All day HD-I pedagogy session is held with five Dutch speaking faculty members, two of which are recently returned volunteers, Jan William Rosenboom and Haris Hisman, and two are new faculty members Harri and Hermine Rodenberg (who is on the NSC).

Internal: The week is highlighted by the arrival of three volunteers for training who are welcomed with the electricity being fixed.

Contradiction: Assuming that "6:00 and all is well" when in reality in the midst of missional diversity key tactics are falling though the cracks. (Week 5)

AREA ROME

THE ROME HOUSE

External: Quarter III planning of I-2000 Trek design of two-week circuits to 10 major cities to ensure geographical coverage while doing I-2000 interviews.

Internal: Send out Maureen to the GRC in Brussels. Ilona J. and Bill Staples are married in Canada on January 3, 1983.

Contradiction: Setting up systems that co-ordinate the external mission with the internal life, with one effective working person in Rome in order not to fall behind in the quarter's missional thrust. (Week 2)

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

External: Danish scouts request follow up for FREM Ethnic Program. Further ICA-WHO program links open up during IERD co-sponsorship visit to Geneva. Research trek to management and education institutions in England and Wales provides new directions for "Youth in Development" program.

Internal: Team re-groups with a celebration after returning from London, Jakarta, Brussels, Geneva and Sydney.

Contradiction: Incorporating new global maneuvers in our local programs which form the essential basis of our area formulation. (Week 5)*

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Global dimension of task grounded as most of troops find themselves coming and going to GRA, Global Priory meeting, Bi-continental meetings and Bi-continental Integrated Development Circuit.

Internal: George and Ruthe celebrate 37th wedding anniversary at Bi-continental meetings in Brussels; George celebrates 62nd birthday in Wien as Ruthe leaves for London Bi-continental Integrated Development circuit.

Contradiction; Defering local area and regional task due to continuing "Revolving Door". (Week 5)*

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: Royal Netherlands Embassy contributes LE3,000 for preschool facility, water system electrification. First Cluster wide training session for HCT has 18 around the table. Fifteen passenger van arrives for HCT program compliments of Ford Foundation. Marmalade factory production starts under local council ownership.

Internal: Bayad spins with activity as five groups of guests are hosted including new first secretary of Canadian Embassy, who returns a week later with a CIDA representative from Ottawa.

Contradiction: Getting IERD NSC organized quickly when tactics to initiate the kind of high level Gouvernement Committee required seem to be out of our hands. (Weeks 5,6)*

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: The Quarter planning session generates an in-depth preparation for the Cluster Health Programme. One moter bike finally arrives in the Cluster, allowing one of three teams to have transportation.

Internal: Patricia Allan is assigned to work and gets a job within 24 hours after being assigned.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between planning and implementation that has occured through lack of training. (Week 1)

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Azombie T/M set of 20 villages in Imo state climaxed by a great assembly with the King and 15 chiefs saying a big yes to the one year follow-up timeline. A team of two Ghanaian Volunteers and Olatungie couple discover they could win the victory.

Internal: Bells return from a three week sojourn in Abidjan to renew their visas in time to celebrate the T/M victory, their 29th wedding anniversary, Owo's 28th birthday, the opening of a new House location in Onlu and the sending out of Micah Amvah back to Ghana after a two months sojourn.

Contradiction: Timing the moves that will create the critical mass toward Human Development in the east while securing permanent visas for the Bells. (Week 11)

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Lions Club holds Health Camp at HDTI centre where over 600 patients attend from 20 villages. Development trek to copperbelt returns with Kwacha 861 (USD 757) and 3300 working of three at industry is plastered, ending a two year break in construction.

Internal: House begins to look at implications from the Brussels Priors check and Marge Tomlinson is sent out to Chicago at regional colleagues home after two months of extra ordinary work.

Contradiction: Finding ways to demonstrate viable economic ventures and decision making methods. (Week4)

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Three Kabiro Health Outpost staff (two nurses and one counsellor) teach two-day module to Health Auxiliary Training School in Kamweleni intensifying their consultant role. Seven Nairobi troops sent out on development circuits and to support impact campaigns, consults and government LENS. Bank of America owned Commercial Bank of Africa gives 5,000 Kenyan shillings and agrees to send large proposal to Bank of American Foundation.

Internal: House has five collegiums on Brussels' check signals meeting and its wild implications capped by Saturday night song/skit and game celebration which also celebrates Elisha and Caroline Odari family arrival and Joe Slicker's return.

Contradiction: Keeping feet on the spinning log (especially upright) while shooting the rapids of the next two years. (Week 5)

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Three hundred and seventy-seven register for the Kabiro Nursery School for this year, while the School Committee braces for even larger primary registration process next week. An invitation extended to active supporters for a Think-Tank on Kabiro's future. The Construction Guild moves into new contract organization with a contract for 20,000 blocks and 200 roofing panels from the coast butchery located right here in Kabiro.

Internal: Sam Were is sent out to teach the twelfth HDTI to be held in Kenya.

Contradiction: Making sure that the reorganization of the School and the construction guilds result in effective engagement rather than bankruptcy. (Week 2)

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Health Training with 132 people from the Section is held in Kangagi Sub-Location. Impact set up in North Tinire prepares 45 villages for VAM. VLEM is held in the South Tiriki location with 47 people who help with circuiting.

Internal: House inkind supplies, one bundle of soap and two buckets for Section Project directors meeting with representatives from nine projects in the section.

Contradiction: Operating Programmes in the midst of funeral's implementation. (Week 3)

NAIROBI-THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: Nthagaya Sub-Location says yes to becoming our first Cluster Project in Embu district. Mugumoini village is a lively place with a community center workday and a mobile clinic with 360 patients. Business begins for new staff with circuit training and health team getting right on the road.

Internal: New and old staff arrive to begin the Quarter and are impacted by fine shape of the House after three weeks of only two people.

Contradiction: Recreating our self story so that in the midst of being new we have permission to know what we know. (Week 1)

MOMBASA-THE KAMWELINI HOUSE

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY-THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: A visit by a representative of the Dutch government enables old leaders, S. Olatkes, Pundit Uthavun and Punlik Dangere to retell the story of Maliwada.

Internal: The House completes its quarterly planning with a celebration and decides to write one family from Maliwada to join in the weekly Roundtable. Maliwada leaders are taking turns to lead the Ashram collegiums starting with Punlik Dangere, on the Ambassadors Guild.

Contradiction: Articulating the new story that will allow people to participate in the work of Maliwada and the Cluster. (Week 2)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: The whole House witnesses 26 January (Republic Day) celebration in eight cluster villages and catalyses the distribution of 300 preschool uniforms. Cluster Team and Moho villagers organize Animal Camp enabling the inoculation of 70 cattle. Training Centre Team successfully completes the closing of the land transfer after fourteen months dogged pursuit through bureaucratic mazes. Regional Team circuits to Khambale and Vaviharsh and catalyses a common picture of needed programmes from Mico Co.; Siemeus Corporatina and the Khambale villagers.

Internal: Half the Ashram participates in Area Council in Maliwada. The Phadtare family celebrates its fifth anniversary of marriage at weekly Ritual. House holds conversation on Human-Factor impact of 26 January village celebration.

Contradiction: Building one consensus out of House Quarter III plan and Area Council plan that will enable concerted action. (Week 4)

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Medicine for the Vaviharsh Village is received from D.M.O. Nasik, and an authorisation letter comes for the Ghoti P.H.C. service. A film show about family planning and the Castisan village map is submitted to the Environmental Office.

Internal: A daily newspaper for the Ashrams is created.

Contradiction: Dealing with transportation problems in order that the Cluster visit can be on time. (Week 12)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: The Annual Appeal team collects Rs180 from villages in the cluster. (This is a first!) Second cluster circuit in the block has four more workdays with 215 people participating. The Integrated Rural Development Programme which includes local government, two banks, and industrialist representatives invites the ICA to its planning meetings for block planning. New tap water drinking systems are sanctioned for two villages. The Bharat Agro Industries Foundation secures a spot in Jawale village for a percolation tank which would provide irrigation for 85 acres of land.

Internal: The Global Panchayat drops in and conducts an IERD project selection workshop with the whole House which reaffirms the demonstration Jawale HDP is and the amount of learning and experience present in the House about cluster actualization.

Contradiction: Establisbing the Phase III development story through the demonstration of leadership responsibility for actuation. (Week 5)

PUNE—THE MALE HOUSE

External: Five cement bags are donated by Nap Engineering to the Maale Training Centre. A great meeting is held with Mr. Rathappa Kumbhar, the External Minister, at Ichalkaraiyee on the 23rd of December with the ICA staff and village leaders concerning the Maale irrigation schemes actuation. Mehta and Mehta Company of Kolhepur donates one bicycle to the Maale Ashram for Cluster work.

Internal: The water taker is supplied by L.P. to Maale. Mr. Mukesh Taksadde works with us. Great House celebration is held on the 25th of December with two village guests.

Contradiction: (Week 12)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: A new bicycle is purchased. The circuit model (House to House visit) is put into use. The Health Department promises a film showing for the Cluster village.

Internal: The House enjoys a week of Roundtable, new room cleaning and decor, and the Khirismus festival Celebration.

Contradiction: Pushing the New Auxiliary and followup for "Good Internal Structures". (Week 12)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: Two great women's meetings are held, creating three-month plans in Cluster villages of Karenjo-Kaji and Bhankheda. Social survey and electricity survey completed for all Cluster villages. Sevagram Sarpanch promises to get mason to finish drainage begun by workday.

Internal: House celebrates 33rd Republic Day, January 26, with formal debates. Collegiums include witness training and report on Area Council in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Recreating images of self-sustaining local industry. (Week 4)*

NAGPUR—THE TEMBURWAHI HOUSE

External: Ten bags of cement arrive for Panvel Cluster villages. Mahila Mandal president visits Khadi Village Industry and Village Bakery Factory. Dewada Information Officer has a site visit with a documentary film. We got 10 bags cement for Ranveli Cluster Village. Three village tribal people (children) survey done. Temburwahi Mahila Mandal president visit to Khadi Village Industry for village Bakery Factory. We give the old record of Temburwahi CDA to Ballarpur Paper Mill Manager. We fix stake sign board in Temburwahi. Volleyball is inkinded.

Internal: Ashram celebrates Makar Sankarnt festival and sends Area Team out. Collegium states future vision for Cluster actuation, Human Development Association and Chandra bimetro. We celebrate the beginning of 1983 with a Makar Sankarnt festival in the Ashram. We welcome our new British colleagues from WCDS. We receive IERD Spotlights and a letter from Sir James Lindsay from Brussels. A site visit from the information office Dewada includes a very effective documentary film show.

Contradiction: Coordinating time rhythms for actuation between village men and women and four-sector representatives. (Week 2)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: During the Cluster Consult, ten villages are visited, with the Dabhad villagers participating. In Digrus village 45 people took part in a workday. At the end of the Consult a 14 page document was produced in English and Marathi.

Internal: In preparation for the Consult, new lighting and decor are done in the Ashram, and eating utensils are secured. Representatives of the four sectors visits the House during the Consult.

Contradiction: Maintaining village participation during the cotton season. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Twenty-fifth January, sees opening of Cluster Health Centre on twice weekly basis. Doctor attends one day a week and nurse circuits villages to teach people who are unable to visit the clinic. Members of the team attend a feast held at Ashraf's house to celebrate his father attaining the title of Choudhary (respected village leader). Forty-four development visits release more of Faridabad's resources. Visit with P.A.D.I. shows their interest to sponsor multiple Rural Development Symposiums across the area.

Internal: Alan returns from Brussels check signals meeting. Jared, a volunteer from London, eventually returns after his seven week confinement in hospital.

Contradiction: Getting visible miracles in the Cluster quickly while focusing on all the fronts. (Week 2)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Whirlwind Sri Lanka (Colombo Region) trek by multi-cultural ICA quartet secures Sri Lanka's participation in the IERD, symbolized by 18 attending NSC meeting at the Governem'ts Ministry of Plan Implementation, and by a strong commitment by government organisations and NGO's present to do the necessary preparation to send a delegation to Delhi in February 1984. Forty Gunjurpalya T-shirts sold at Brussels Check signals meeting, launch village fund with 1500 rupees. Gram Sabha and Shramadam fever grips the Cluster with four Gram Sabhas and two Shramadams in the Cluster Villages, awakening people to the potential of the upcoming Cluster Consult.

Internal: House life continues to be in a state of fruitful transition, with the restructuring of the kitchen, a birthday, a relative's visit, and a telegram from two volunteers offering their help to Gunjurpalya.

Contradiction: Securing a highly visible economic sign in the Cluster. (Week 4)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Two Imaginal Education courses at Serotto Teachers' Center with over 100 participants generate interest in Bustee work. Mr. Upadya, Principal of J.J. Agemera, visits House. First order of 9000 plastic bags is completed and delivered.

Internal: Following a week of late night working House celebrates Manoj Prasad's eighth birthday with the Regional Team.

Contradiction: Ensuring the common mind in midst of many foci. (Week 4)

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Sixty people from 15 nations participated in the Jakarta GRA, the first in this two year series, which opened with the Chairman and the Vice Chairman of the Board of ICA. Indonesia present and Professor Selo Sumarja, advisor to the president, giving the opening address. The Assembly was punctuated by two signal plenaries and two great celebrations--a disco and a sate feast. The Jakarta Think Tank results were mailed out; proposals for a total of US\$56,000 were submitted; and Jakarta Region hosted an area meeting on our government agreement relative to our work in Indonesia.

Internal: Another Global Language School gets underway a scant 36 hours after the request is made. The Panchayat does a collegium on HDZ in Latin America, North America and India.

Contradiction: Creating a model for how to keep programmatic activity going during Quarter III in an area and region during assignments to GLS in Surabaya, Pacific Training School, covering Medan priorship and working on the government agreement. (Week 11)

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Reports, proposals and research all become key tactics for HDZ actuation. Two required Government reports transform boring lists of accomplishments into imaginal education tools to impact their recipients, while a health program proposal is said "yes" to by local officials and research begins on a preschool training proposal.

Internal: Two HDZ preschool teachers visit House in Medan for a national three week training course. Roundtable gives students an English lesson through a study of Global Research Centrum "Feast and Fast" paper used by House to prepare for own Global and Fast Day January 31. Romanus Wa'u surprises House by testing the TOEFEL English exam for the first time.

Contradiction: Being asked to make a proposal to a Government Rural Development office, finds the House without a village consensus on its development priorities, upon which to base the proposal. (Week 4)*

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: Programme marketing and Development calls total seven companies visited. Programme tracking chart goes up and more appointments are set for the coming weeks.

Internal: Elizabeth Caperton arrives for four days development. House spends one day at the "Thaipusam Festive" a Hindu Festival at Batu Caves with 700,000 people.

Contradiction: Solidifying programme momentum in order to raise the bottom lines for both self-support and programmes. (Week 4)*

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: Women's survey class ends with celebrative closing ceremony. A "Gotong Royong" held in Belang-Belang preschool repairs the floor and paints the walls. Rochmat is assigned to (Pengembangan Mesyarahat) for ten days as a consultant for the initiation of a training program for Community Development in South Sulawesi.

Internal: Stovall's received their long awaited work permit and are sent out to Surabaya for G.L.S. English scrabble game has all Indonesian staff participating in Roundtable.

Contradiction: Trying to make best use of available staff for future training program. (Week 5)*

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: House finalises Quarter III assignments and creates a model for a two week Japanese workcamp in Sudtonggan-Mactan in March. A visit to Putsan with two staff from Union Oil's Los Angeles office creates an opportunity to discuss expansion and future continuation of the Putsan Project.

Internal: Kevin Grady arrives from Boston on the first stage of his global tour. House celebrates with global fast and international film festival movie "Francis" impacting everyone with the tension between freedom and responsibility.

Contradiction: Experiencing ourselves on a train going full steam ahead without clarification on roles needed and future models. (Week 5)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Hong Kong's Symposium on effective approaches is moving but has already changed from a single event focus to a six month program with possibility of a major sponsor. Authorization visits have begun with lunch with Global advisor.

Internal: Invention of the Order paper takes four sessions and allows us to rehearse the journey and the raw decision to be. The practical focus came in clearing the office for boxes filled with files still hanging around from the House move.

Contradiction: Creating the story and the new procedures for a six month regional program. (Week 6)*

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Excellent visits with top government officials solidify support for the IERD. Schedule is set for a four-day tour of the Government's demonstration villages all across the island, with the council for Agricultural Planning and Development providing staff and mini-bus for ICA staff and members of the Steering Committee. First of a series of supervisors' training sessions is done for a major management training center in Taipei.

Internal: House hosts the new David Hutcheon's family briefly on their way to Nam Wai, welcomes Global trekker Kevin Grady from Boston and celebrates the return of Rebecca Grow from the faculty of Tonga P.T.S.

Contradiction: Building the systems that allow us to follow through properly on our priority arenas, while maintaining the flexibility to respond quickly to unexpected openings. (Week 5)*

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Joel Robinson and Bob King from Los Angeles visit Putsan and tour the beautified ceramic soil crusher and poultry industry and community administration office building. The tour was highlighted by preschool children who demonstrated singing and reading the alphabet. Nursery garden planted eight mangoes and six jackfruit seedlings and propagated cabbage, pechay, chili, eggplant, tomato, and string beans for community nutrition. The Putsan House and Manila House staff estimate proposed budget of Putsan expansion.

Internal: House planning includes a study of the social process triangles, organizational charts, cooperative operation and spirit life guide for the new staff. Week was highlighted by celebrating the 19th birthday of the new intern Purification Condat and the arrival of Vicky Aguirang from Manila House for audit preparation.

Contradiction: Finding effective strategy for training local staff to be in charge of cluster expansion around Tiwi. (Week 5)*

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: February curriculum for Early Learning Nutrition Centers is distributed in Mactan 24. Dental clinic in BangBang is highlighted by OEH and POPCOM offices in Lapulapu City which donate medicine and vitamins. ECONOMIC KKK loan in Bagong Dalan is set up. Squash field finished cultivation, ampalaya farm pest control (fugicide, insecticide). Sud. Coop. seminar completed in two day training and it was highlighted with officer election and the short talk of the city agriculturist officer and visit to Sudtonggan farm. Sudtonggan participants are ready to face the two days seminar which will be run by VICTO. Five ampalaya plots recultivated and will be ready for next planting. The health program of M-24 were started by the first dental clinic in Sam Miguel for this year '83, and followed by another free clinics in Matumbo and Bagong Dalan, and two mothers classes in Babag II and Bankal. The highlight of the Sudtonggan staff was the M-24 ELNC Tea-wide meeting where all of them shared their ideas how to orchestrate the coming Health FAir on March '83.

Internal: CALTEX film crew is hosted and films social and economic programs. Health Fair preparation initiates beautification campaign. The House staff participated in Bangbang Fiesta, one of the project in M-24. The House creating a new House structure for this year 83. five new model chadeller shells decor in collegium room. Artchel and Libeth celebrated their seventh and fifth birthday anniversary.

Contradiction: Focussing the expansion and improvement of economic programs and enabling the new focus of social programs in Mactan. (Week 6)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: With the return of staff from Tonga Training School we have a check signals meeting for the Japan Houses. Regional Colleague pioneers a Rural Development Think Tank and ICA staff attends. Program and Development produces Y160,000 this week.

Internal: Week of send outs: Geoff C. and Julie R. to Australia and Kris K. to San Francisco and Tumiyo Tabira to hospital for appendectomy.

Contradiction: finalizing our planning so we can get into the driving seat instead of being driven by all the activity. (Week 5)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Industrial company oil spill damage compensation for cluster village shellfish is resolved in unprecedented single meeting, with villagers and company both crediting their existing relationship as human development project partners. IERD prep continues with visits to Ministry of Home Affairs and Global Board Advisor, firm scheduling of Rural Development Symposia, and draft of official letter of invitation to the Korean government.

Internal: David and Sook Ja Hutcheons are sent out to new assignment in Nam Wai after three and one-half years in Area Tokyo including every project site (four) in Korea. New internal life design moves family night and Roundtable and includes folk dancing on Saturday night.

Contradiction: dFixing local IERD images while global images remain vague and uncharted. (Week 4)

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: PSU on phasing of HDZ initiation unites Regional Team in developing images and strategies to extend services to Cheong Won County. Twenty two Cheong Won Cluster leaders attend 44 hour training course at new training center in Ceong Ju city, signaling villagers readiness to relate to the urban. Village leaders host eight pastors and seven elders at the closing celebration.

Internal: The internal life collegium reminds the team of our intentional life style and the spirit care of our weekly rhythm work.

Contradiction: Defining crucial local team work to enhance HDZ process in the midst of ambiguous direction of HDZ. (Week 5)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: Regional Planning event on Sunday draws 15 people (10 colleagues) for a fine all day event and ends with an Advisor doing the witness at Sunday celebration for 19. Roundtable has 10 guests and we rediscover the great fun and power of writing a song and creating a symbol. Okinawa village sends their four TM's report and staff makes five IERD calls. After Wednesday English class for members, there advisors stay to work on a new brochure for ICA.

Internal: Jean Hansen and Shizuyo get new classes teaching English; Other world collegiums freshen our spirit; David Reese returns from a fine Tonga PTS and brings a report from Tokyo on the Brussels Meeting given by Sandra.

Contradiction: Keeping our "in but not of" transestablishment stance while pursuing Regional establishment for IERD participation. (Week 5)*

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: Nine Japanese teachers of English participate in Speech Module at Shogokukan Home English School and were excited by a new method of speech preparation. Philippines Work Camp is main topic of discussion and lots of planning as decisions are made on the focus, the cost and the coordination. The whole event is enlivened by Mr. Hase's slide presentation of last year's trip at FNATI (Friday Night at the Institute). Academy grad, Takako Kawamura demonstrates the practicality of her recent training with a fine art form conversatin as host.

Internal: Week of "New Opportunities" begins with Sunday celebration Address from Mrs. Yoshikawa on "life is never the way you want it". The week's collegiums on Office of Terce highlights the difficult process of transposition within a multi-cultural setting. The cancellation of the Asian Academy re-opens question of providing depth training for staff and regional colleagues.

Contradiction: Coordinating tasks to enable everyone's participation in the struggle and in the victory when there is a variety of tasks, talents and schedules. (Week 5)*

THE SAPPORO HOUSE

External: Government sponsored Town Meeting circuit in Aomori Prefecture has a new image as ICA staff is driven from one town to another in black limosenes. We are received by mayors and planning groups as community consultants, and work with them on specific issues. Machiko Horuichi gets paid writer's fee for publicizing ICA programs in the newspaper.

Internal: Mr. Uchigashima gives exciting report on his trip to Indian Houses and Chikhale project. He wears longi and Karta, and serves Indian tea while showing slides and telling the story.

Contradiction: Being patient as program directors come into focus but aren't yet clear enough to timeline the details. (Week 4)

Perth Regional Team reports that two shires in the Western Wheat belt are interested in adopting a village in India and training farmers, following Rural Development Symposiums attended by Esme Park, Liza Tod and John Rader. Area council hosted by Melbourne Region includes representatives from all six Regions. Plans are made for Inter Region Programme blitz and circuiting models and self-support strategies are consensed upon.

Internal: Adam Thompson is sent out to teach global lanugage school in Indonesia. Paul Thompson and Daniel Bellamy begin formal Schooling and House search is intensified as we prepare to welcome the Jim and Karen Newkirk family.

Contradiction: While Internal Support foundations are shaking missional cannon cannot be focussed on target. (Week 5)

SYDNEY-THE MURRIN BRIDGE HOUSE

External: Margaret Johnson sent out to Unviersity. She is the first from Murrin Bridge to enter Tertiary Education. Meeting with N.S.W. Aboriginal Education Unit releases Bob Morgan to participate in IERD - NSC and an invitation to speak to Aboriginal Education Consultant Group.

Internal: Staff returns to Murring Bridge after long month on Fat Cow Manoeuvre and Area Council.

Contradiction: Shifting our image of focus from immediate Murring Bridge Area to Region. (Weeks 4,5)*

THE PERTH HOUSE

External: Methods for Teamwork is held with 20 around the table, using a construct combining methods, spirit and vocational reflection. Several programme requests for the next Quarter come from the participants.

Internal: The House is enlivened by the presence of Christina Clark and Barry Oakley, and does several collegiums on the Academy, the Training Centre dynamic and IERD.

Contradiction: Keeping the transition momentum going for 4 more weeks. (Week 11)

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Urban Probe focus is shortened by a visit to Prahran Highrise Community Centre and leaders from that centre attending the Roundtable.

Internal: Perth Babara Bellamy comes to Melbourne and gets four job offers in leading Melbourne Hotels, Piano Bass and two nights worth in the first week.

Contradiction: Embodying the needs of three regional teams while planning and setting up for the Area Council. (Week 2)

AREA SUVA

THE APIA HOUSE

External: PTS preparation continues for Suva, Fiji, and Vava'u, Tonga schools. Curriculum for Vava'u is revised to launch 37 village projects in the Vava'u island group of northern Tonga. Twenty Tongan Pacific faculty leave for Vava'u on the boat to prepare the site with 20 gallons of paint and a container load of materials, gestetner machine, decor, and Kazantzakis completely translated into Tongan. 25 faculty-in-training are expected in Vava'u by January 3 to prepare themselves to lead teams and guilds and to get baseline data on the 37 villages. National Radio interviews Fetuu (Star) Tupou on his return from study abroad (Academy).

Internal: High mood of celebration heralds Star's arrival from Chicago Academy in his blue uniform and wearing wedgeblade pin, of which he states, "Now I really understand what this means and what I must do." Star receives his assignment to Suva PTS saying "Why not" and addresses all with his witness to the sign that Tonga must be for the globe.

Contradiction: Finding adequate space to house trainees and staff upon return from the two PTS. (Week 13)

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

External: Ten days of victorious whirlwind begins with the U.S. National Steering Committee gathering 50 strong--in L.A. for initial session. They celebrate decision to do IERD at Dr. Marwah's palatial Malibu ranch, where Norman Jewison impacts all with praise. Rural Development Symposium: Western States happens in Tulare County with 32 displaying organizations, computerized registration, 130,000 farmers, a beautiful tent, lots of media coverage, and 75 full timers in the workshops. Afternoon forum scheduled with Fellou School staff as program needs become clearer through meeting with Wighland neighborhood and Teller School. Funding proposal for three Denver neighborhood programs move toward final draft and submittal while six troops are assigned to Area Council.

Internal: Olive Anne Slotta joins the Day 1 staff and Larry Hamje is accepted to School of miners.

Contradiction: Making sure the fields get ploughed, barn get cleaned and neighbours get invitations while the farmer and his wife are in the big city and the California Farm. (Week 5)

AREA EDMONTON

External: The continuation of Alberta Potential Academy visits and recruitment highlights the week with visits to Franciscan sisters and eight churches. IERD meeting was held in Edmonton with eight in attendance.

Internal: A successful Area Council was highlighted by the movie Gandhi and an Indian dinner celebration

Contradiction: Building the maneuver which will release program and recruitment bottom line. (Week 4)

Internal: Marj Swacker returns to collegium table and a Nashville colleague, Wayne Robertson, visits the House unexpectedly.

Contradiction: Focusing energies scattered by shifting priorities and selecting a way to symbolize a common mission. (Weeks 5,6)*

THE ATLANTA HOUSE

External: Three calls are made in an Atlanta neighbourhood as a probe into four sector urban positioning. A CYF is held with 60 year 10 youth at North Fulton High School.

Internal: Fast and Frederick Douglas' birthday celebrated with reading from his autobiography marking "black history" month. House celebrates Chinese New Year with promises claimed and much laughter.

Contradiction: Articulating the key block which will inform decisions about where to strategically place emphasis. (Week 6)*

AREA CHICAGO

THE CHICAGO HOUSE

External: Fifth City Business Careers is set up for its largest class ever, (36) with renewed space, all grants and funds in place, providing for a fifth staff person (Fred Hamon) and a new student. The Preschool Board Meeting reveals that they are operating in the black. Four hundred invitations were sent out for the ground breaking ceremony for the Auto Center on February 18, 1983.

Internal: A study at Roundtable of The Hazards of Being Male brings consciousness of the male revolution.

Contradiction: Catching the wind and sailing with innovative program and broad self-support. (Week 5)

THE DETROIT HOUSE

External: The first every THIRD—WEEKEND—OF—THE—MONTH LENS TUTORIAL is held packing 42 people into the Training Center's J. W. Mathews Room. Group is exciting and curious: one third new team members and one third mysteriously brand new people. Ten Regional Team members travel to Bangor to participate in an HDZ "highlight" site visit and join 40 Bangor citizens in an initial planning event for the Rural Development Symposium to be held in May during Michigan Week.

Internal: Three intern conversations are held and House members begin imagining necessary and welcomed shifts. A week of Big Thinks and heavy stewing over-eight constructs including the First Force One meeting, the RDS planning event, internal life shifts, Apple III training, Women's Nite Event, Grand Rapids Metro Evening at the Institute and intern conversation formats.

Contradiction: Organizing the operational implications of the Rural Development Symposium being held in May in Michigan -- everything through the eye of the needle. (Weeks 2,3)

CLEVELAND-THE INDIANAPOLIS HOUSE

External: A Pilot Think Tank on Humanizing Technology is held at King Island with a surprising balance of light fun and profound probing. A five-hour Regional Council follows the Think Tank the morning after, resulting in cohesive tactics on the Mid-America Symposium, Elder Power, and Regional Team Assignments to Mid-North courses, Area, and Continental events.

Internal: Kathy Krause sojourns for a week and produces the Butler Series flyer. Burt Dyson and David Speicher team up to put all mailing lists on the computer including 200 new names. A new Roundtable Rhythm is created to consolidate eventfulness on the "Great Thursday Night of the Month" and the "Great Sunday of the Month."

Contradiction: Restructuring the Metro Core dynamic to pull off Mid-North. (Week 3)

AREA NEW YORK

THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: The Regional Team launches four Effective Leadership courses in the bi-region with the largest of 15 community leaders in the New York Area Training Center. On Saturday the Area Development P.S.U. was held in the New York House in spite of the 22 inches of snow that fell the night before. Six women colleagues from Wilton, Connecticut came to the New York Area Training Center for a site visit and were impacted by the building and its location in New York City

Internal: The collegiums this week pushed our thinking as we did a study on the book Choice of Heroes, had a report from the RDS in Los Angeles, a pedagogy for the new Effective Leadership course and began planning for our sojourn week coming up in week 10.

Contradiction: Bridging the Imaginal Gap between story of IERD and regional program focus. (Week 6)*

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: Articulation of strategic directors confirmed by Regional Team creation of detailed plan for next marketing maneuver and regional newsletter. Arrangements made with Russell Sage College Center for Women's Education to cosponsor a seminar on women and development.

Internal: Janice Ulanga's visit forms occasion for two days of Team planning.

Contradiction: Getting maneuvers underway in midst of full schedule of activities to avoid prolonged campaigns. (Week 3)*

THE WASHINGTON HOUSE

External: Frame appointments focus on updating people on NSC meeting in Los Angeles and other IERD victories. House spends Week II on Computer Paradigm Strategies PSU and sends representatives to Area Development PSU.

Internal: Internal Life Manual is presented to House members as a key symbol in Year of Order Formation and House hosts six guests during the week. Blizzard of '83 keeps all of us "together" over three-day period.

Contradiction: Deciding what to bracket in order to release full corporate power on self-support venture. (week 6)*

THE BOSTON HOUSE

External: Kevin Grady, Boston Metro colleague, departs for a 16 month Global Odyssey with plans to sojourn in Taiwan, Philippines, Jakarta and India. Paul LeVie and Elsa Bengel meet with Stonehill College to discuss a proposal for a one-week Imaginal Education Teacher's Institute in June. The January update goes out right on schedule.

Internal: Week II is the highlight; includes Friday night at the children's Museum, PSU in Starks on the woodworks, a rehab miracle done on the pantry by the creative cluster, development and Marilyn Corcoren's 28th birthday celebration.

Contradiction: Designing our time as a House to corporately prepare for Area Council reports and planning. (Week 3)

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: Starks Enterprises Corporation meets with Clem Barry, Starks Community Development Officer who is managing the C.D.B. Grant for rehab housing and sewage, at his request to talk about economic development for the future. Tim works with Department of Transportation strategy session -2nd of three with construction companies and trains workers in Danforth who are working full-time for five weeks.

Internal: Wendy goes to Wilmette, Illinois upon death of her mother, Virginia Rose. Five Starks families join the House in going in the Chinese New Year (of the Boar) with resident Frank Chin doing the honours.

Contradiction: Standing as the troops before many battlefronts - deciding on Strategy to win the whole war. (Week 6)*

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: Human Development-I for (\$6,000) brings 41 Metis local leaders together around the table for depth training and planning event. The Area Council is highlighted by HDZ visioning from the Area and celebrated by seeing "Gandhi" movie. Joint Area-Centrum manoeuvre to Ottawa re:IERD (capital frame) is capped by Senator Molson's collegial visit.

Internal: The whole House spend one week creating the (6ft. by 8ft.) five banners and the new methods manual to be used for upcoming courses in the Region.

Contradiction: Weaving Regional Advantages into an unified campaign strategy for the province. (Week 5)

THE OTTAWA HOUSE

External: Evenings are given over to quarter planning in which colleagues participate, and which yield an exciting experience of breakthroughs in the external focus and House life. A colleague sets up and hosts two guest dinners signalling first contact and possible program relationship that we've had for a long time with the Francophone community.

Internal: The House catches the excitement of the computer age in doing research on a home computer and its possible applications.

Contradiction: Giving Practical form and focus to the imagined future. (Week 3)

THE MONTREAL HOUSE

External: As ten contacts with Ingersol Rand Co. open the door for a visit with Canadian V.P. and serious conversation about funding for the first time. Methods Training for Planetary Initiatives deeply excites them and opens up further contacts with women's teachers, and church groups, and complements ongoing recruitment for VJL.

Internal: Spirit life increases as on the job "stories of new life" are shared at the supper table by Doug Allan and the Fishers report on the Ontario Metis and Non Status Indian Association HD-I at Niagara Falls. Robert Yallop and Sharon Farrar both assist with development and strategy sessions.

Contradiction: Sustaining initial VJL enthusiasm to a full term happening. (Week 6)*

AREA MEXICO CITY

THE MEXICO CITY HOUSE

External: Thanks to high recommendation from Jakarta LENS, Time/Life Corp. accepts LENS proposal and immediately schedules first LENS for February 24-26. Spanish LENS team called and confirmed in one day. Guatemala/Mexico city team consensus reached on Agricultural Implementation Module for March 7-12, releasing Lida Ver Nooy for computer software research trip to Tulare Rural Development Symposium. San Camilo completes five training sessions for coming CYF, prints six-month Parish Report and publishes Newsletter.

Internal: House host Fr. Rafael and Fr. Benjamin Bravo in evening of future visioning and helps celebrate Order of Eucharistic Sister of Saint Teresa's 43rd birthday.

Contradiction: Delivering on what we've promised now that new doors are opened. (Week 5)*

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: Visit of the American Ambassador and his wife along with USAID official, coincides with the official opening of the Agricultural Co-operative. The Governor of the province, head of the National Coop, sub director of the Committee for National Reconstruction and a host of other dignitaries were in attendance. National Steering Committee launched with another visit to UNDP. One-quarter million dollar USAID proposal submitted with ambassador's approval.

Internal: Twenty chickens are delivered to auxiliary for self-support. Jack Gilles and Bill Slicker arrive for week. Month's planning completed with Agricultural Implementation Module scheduled.

Contradiction: Getting the initial ten farmers to sign loans without a clear picture of what profitable crop(s) will be grown. (Week 3)*

AREA HAVANA

THE KINGSTON HOUSE

External: The Woburn Lawn HDTI has a tremendous first week of the Economic Cycle with nine agencies sending panelists. The Heritage Encounter includes Port Royal, Hope Gardens and Spanish Town and the leadership Lab focuses on Imaginal Methods. the Kingston Team visits the United Vendors Association with plans made for a site visit to Woburn Lawn and a forum for the new vendors Arcade and looks at many houses and schools in order to establish an urban base. Belgian Ambassador calls us with news that ICCO (Dutch) is interested in funding for the Cluster.

Internal: House sends out three U.S. volunteers and becomes two teams - HDTI faculty and Kingston centre.

Contradiction: Launching National Steering Committee at the same time as initiating the HDTI and finding a Kingston facility. (Week 4)*

AREA LIMA

THE LIMA HOUSE

External: The Region celebrates the completion of DePauw University's two-week project. A total of 3000 patients is seen in 12 communities by the medical/dental team and 60 health caretakers are trained. Phase I of the training center construction (1300 sq. ft. earthquake proof building) is completed. Forty people are recruited for a three-week HDTI beginning in two weeks.

Internal: The House experiences the joy of being a disciplined Religious House again after 40 HDTI participants leave and Judith returns from Brussels.

Contradiction: Designing the structures that maintain Religious House continuity in midst of massive programs which engulf the House. (Week 3)

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: Caracas Ecclesiola generates great excitement over upcoming Vocational Journey Lab - the name itself is enough to sell the Lab. Curriculum PSU on upcoming Priorship Training Course in Barlovento in March takes course far down the road. Visit with Bishoop Piobello in Los Teques gets positive affirmation for Para-liturgy experiment in Barlovento villages. The intensive dynamic is highlighted in a Stellar Town Meeting in Cano Negro and the intensification of Catechism Classes. The Extensive dynamic is successfully demonstrated by the first mobilization trek to the new cluster village of Cupertino and Town Meetings (96) and (97) in Las Morochas and Pantoja.

Internal: Celebrations of Fr. Jose's 12th anniversary of ordination and Stanley Day's 78th birthday address the word to everyone. Collegiums become the internal life highlight in revealing both spirit and missional direction as the House focuses on "The New Human" talk, a reflection on the month of January and the Quarter's budget.

Contradiction: Procuring consistent public sector involvement in the Barlovento villages when the personnel is constantly changing. (Week 4)*

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: House sends out an eight person delegation to Peru three-week training school - included is the president of Lampas County-wide Association of Community Associations. Total travel costs kept at a low \$1080(US) by excellent ticket bargaining and the help of the flexibility provided by special approval of visas by the Peruvian Embassy without return tickets. The Lampa Mayor helps with \$200, and the travelers participate fully in fund raising by sponsoring a dance in Sol de Septiembre and going on development visits. Seven people decide to participate in the CICC in Aspetia, Peru and to raise part of their passage funds through visits to donors, a dance, and other means of development. The directors of the "neighborhood organization" in Sol de Septiembre continue their journey of self-sufficiency by forming commissions to deal with the challenges facing their community.

Internal: Studies in Bonhoffer's Freedom paper and the Immense Journey by Easley and our first visit for a new House are all ways of beckoning the 100 interns.

Contradiction: Releasing the teams from the many ambiguities to engage their creativity into finding the solutions to the comprehensive priorities we have identified. (Weeks 4,5)

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: Development banks Cz \$780,000 (US\$3,000); three key guardians request involvement in IERD; and national rural extension service (EMBRATER) sends letters to all their state directors to catalyze research into programs in their state suitable for a national symposium and India exposition.

Internal: House participates in life of Brazilian team members by welcoming back Dagnar from a months vacation, helping Nussy and family move (within blocks of house!) and attending a BBQ hosted by Lidnia.

Contradiction: Empowering our own story and vision with simplified imagery and symbols. (Week 5)*

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: The Continent is engaged in discerning the necessary event (re/Council) as preparation for participation in January Global meeting and launching the next six months.

Internal: House celebrates Carol Walter's arrival.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from static images re/Council Design. (Week 9)

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: Negotiations are complete on the Sevagram facility for New Skills Training. All centrums are represented at Bombay Area Council.

Internal: The House hosts Kevin Balm, receives Jill Egland and sends her to the Bombay Area Council the same day.

Contradiction: How to journey the existing quarter plan through the global check signals resolves, so that we have concrete pictures and strategies for the rest of the year. (Week 3)*

THE HONG KONG NEXUS HOUSE

External: Two large faculties are finally confirmed for the Tonga and Fiji schools, then disrupted by a reassignment crisis as the Fiji school is postponed at the last moment.

Internal: "Best Ever" New Year's Eve party features 30 guests including 25 young Chinese English students and Elaine Telford's parents from New Zealand.

Contradiction: Ensuring the creation and implementation of those long-range models which will undergird every program and guard fiscal responsibility. (Week 13)

THE CHICAGO NEXUS HOUSE

External: Computer training gets representatives from all Centrums oriented to IBM PC's. Brochures for RDS and Program Marketing are in process. Space transformation brings sparkle to public areas and Centrums.

Internal: The House sends out Blase and Roseanne Sands to Area Houston and welcomes Darrell and Sue Marley and their daughter Sara.

Contradiction: Moving ahead with timelined demands when the tendency is to wait for reports from the Brussels Global Priors' and Band Meetings. (Week 2)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum Chicago reports that first steps are taken in implementing a new mode as new teams create their spaces, six new uses of the IERD, and spend time on researching new targets. The new IERD concept paper finalized and submitted in support of a world bank proposal. Nine Team spaces identified and initially claimed for more consistent quarter-long operations. The key contradiction lies in the arena of meeting immediate demands in midst of reconfiguring the troops and forging the story and systems necessary for a futuristic, corporate thrust.

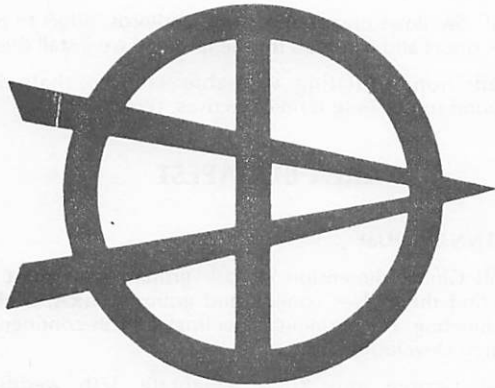
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Very successful seven session Imaginal Leadership course completed for group of religious orders working with the gypsies in the province of Valencia. National Steering Committee meeting creates an intensive timeline of events leading to an early June R.S.D. Brussels team arrives to begin first week of an integrated trek contacting new companies, individual donors and Academy prospects. House traveled to Navares de Enmedia in Segovia to participate in the long awaited dedication of their new residence for the elderly, for which ICA helped inkind many needed appliances.

Internal: A week of welcoming: Jim Campbell and Maria Maguire from Brussels, Barbara and Lucy after a 12 hour drive through the snow from Valencia and Patrice Vrona from the HDTI in Lamego. Five guests at Roundtable are turned on with the study of Toffler's 3rd wave marriage paper.

Contradiction: Getting the hooks into solid commitment on funding, IERD participation and the Academy.ium. (Week 5)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: First week of the HDTI closes in the parish center in Cambres with participants from nine villages and four countries, including Eneida and two other Brazilians here to intern for the year. Highlights of the week include guest agricultural engineers from Vila Real University who gave live demonstrations on grape growing, cows, sheep and goats, soil testing, and forrages. An excursion to their demonstration farms in Vila Real ended joyfully with a tour of the Mateus Winery. Weekend Imaginal Education course brings increased participants and puts Portuguese interns up front in workshops.

Internal: House welcomes the Alerdings and Lucy and three Brazilian school participants. Paths cross as Russell returns from Brussels and Paul leaves for Continental Council there.

Contradiction: Meshing school objective of training a Portuguese national staff, focusing on village participants and allowing international participants to participate in a non-translated Portuguese school - all at the same time! (Week 4)

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: IERD Sub-Committees are inaugurated with meetings this week on location for the RDS. While the Banks are visiting London - Liz contributes great assistance to work on the primary health care frame. Development results in 250p from Barlays Bank and an additional donation from a regular giver.

Internal: The sojourners hit the inkind trail en masse strategy bringing back 20 litres of paint, all necessary brushes, rollers and supplies, 10 room-size carpets (not scraps) and an extra bonus of a sack of chestnuts with the market run.

Contradiction: Running a fine volunteer training event without appearing strained at doing all the necessary deeds. (Week 4)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Time-line through the National Symposium is built with unprecedented realism, courage and commitment. The 1983 study series begins. External: Three open houses in twelve days expose 130 people to corporate living and corporate mission. "Stop the world" room (worship room) is the major attention-getter superceding the report of the men's study group. Three "think twice" programs for high schools teach us a lot about Belgians, as well as assisting in self-support.

Internal: Doug Rettig's letter addressing the issues of feminism, women's advancement and the role of men, rocks the House, supplying us with new insight. Letters from Ann Dodge, David Heslop, Jenny Finnigan, Karen Kivimaki, Birgit Ottka, and others suggest that the G.O.R. gets read!

Contradiction: As the Dark Night of the Soul is once again seen through, how do we avoid being blinded by the light? (Week 10)

AREA FRANKFURT

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Three regional circuits end the first month of '83. Twenty IERD NSC calls, 'Imaginal Education in Frankfurt, Marketing Training in Amsterdam, two Think tTnks on urban futures are set up in Hamburg and Frankfurt. Ground is gained in calls at the diosecean offices at Trier and Ludwigshaven-Hemshof with colleagues, the Muisselecks and Phr. Theyshon taking the lead.

Internal: The Frankfurt House participated in prep tasks for the Global Priors Check Signals meeting by sending a team of six while the home team continued space expansion by turning a two-room WW II basement bomb shelter into the E.G. playroom and "House Cafe". Holiday merrymakers include Tracy Longacre and Don, Mary Warren and Don Jr. Moffett, all travelers from North America.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the immediacies so that they enable the strategic objectives to move ahead rather than immediatly undermining the corporate thrust. (Week 3)

THE AMSTERDAM HOUSE

External: Volunteer gathering of eight seeks information on possible work with the ICA. HD:I prep and pedagogy for Week 6 course occupies Regional Team and Lieve arrives from Brussels to join all Dutch speaking faculty. Three sojourner volunteers-in-training grid Naarden as geo-social research toward the HDZ.

Internal: Local work begins on a project tracking system to be used by computers which is flexible enough for volunteer information on HDP/HDZs as well as IERD project documentation. Roundtable dialogue over «A Choice of Heroes» points up the indicative for redefining masculine roles in our time.

Guiseppe Deluca committed to Guido Carli visit, a week in the Abruzzi(the area around Termine) and two weeks in Paris.

Internal: A new boarder, English student and grade school tutorials incrise self support by \$100. a week.

Contradiction: Recreating momentum in SEM recruitment, Italy 2000 and the cadre after the fly wheel has stopped for a time. (Week 6)*

AREA STOCKHOLM

THE COPENHAGEN HOUSE

External: FDB Cooperative requests a submission for further funding. DenDansk Spejdercorp requests follow-up program for ethnic minorities comprising a regional consult type two week event. Dr. Mutalac of WHO in Geneva asks for a submission for IERD co-sponsorship within two weeks and names other ways WHO and ICA can develop a working relationship.

Internal: Swallows organization, our landlords, offers to pay for new doors and materials for the facility if we install them.

Contradiction: Initiating winnable tacticcs that also correspond to our long term objectives. (Week 6)*

AREA BUDAPEST

THE VIENNA HOUSE

External: Global dimension of task grounded as most of troops find themselves coming and going to GRA, Global Priory meeting, Bi-continental meetings and Bi-continental Integrated Development Circuit.

Internal: George and Ruthe celebrate 37th wedding anniversary at Bi-continental meetings in Brussels; George celebrates 62nd birthday in Wien as Ruthe leaves for London Bi-continental Integrated Development circuit.

Contradiction; Deferring local area and regional task due to continuing "Revolving Door". (Week 5)*

AREA CAIRO

GIZA — THE EL BAYAD HOUSE

External: Desert irrigation specialist visits Bayad as consultant for the Ten Feddan farm and excites all with the possibilities. He shocks our previous naivete and symbolizes our decision to use «experts» in crucial projects.

Internal: Laundry room plumbing completed, freeing the bathroom from washing tubs and wet clothes.

Contradiction: Systematizing internal structures when external tasks seem to demand more extra-ordinary energy of creativity. (Week 7)*

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: First Health Forum is held in HDZ pilot (Kouadianikro Cluster) with 35 in attendance. The village of Yapikro designates new village delegate to take the place of the previous one who is now interning. Permission is received to begin work with fourth tribe of sous-prefecture(district) completing geographic coverage plan. Third experimental intensive garden plot is dug at centre and two kinds of hybrid corn are planted. Development in Abidjan brings in 75,000CFA(\$250) with 150,000CFA(\$450) working in one week.

Internal: Great mobility and interchange take place between Abidjan and Brobo teams as Development Team comes to Abidjan to tell Brobo story and Pat Allan goes to Brobo to lead Health Forum. Second mobylette is put into service. Parkers are assigned to USA to adopt daughter, Angela Marie.

Contradiction: Preparing the cluster expansion event in the midst of the ambiguity of assignments, timing and image for it. (Week 5)*

AREA LAGOS

THE LAGOS HOUSE

External: Visits to Ijebu-ode, Abeokuta, Enugu assures key guardians to participate in IERD event. Fifteen committed NSC members work in three sub-committees: national participation; project selection and documentation, and budget and fund-raising. Programme provides \$4,500. payment from Ashland for Izombe Human Development Meetings and first developed cash for the Quarter.

Internal: First Roundtable in Orlu envisions women's participation in development and House receives first self-support money from new Orlu job.

Contradiction: Thinking through the many possibilities that can be focused on in the midst of prioritizing the few that will put us in the winners' circle. (Week 5)*

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Strong week of visibility finds grass cut around the clinic and primary school and the second room of the industrial center plastered. Community Development Association holds disciplined meeting which strengthens their interior decision. Christian Children's Fund money gets an affirmative nod by August.

Internal: Whole house experiences the healing as it sits down for the first week in two months to plan the next six months. Spear Lubesha is sent out to deal with marriage and extended family.

Contradiction: Creating a sustaining time design that uses the troops effectively. (Week 5)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Team strategizes with Nairobi Ford Foundation representative on how they could fund IERD globally as ICA receives the second half of Ford's grant. Development breaks open future with site visits for the SIPA and EEC. ICA receives permission to submit major grants to Pfizer, Bank of America and Firestone. Health Caretakers come together from all over Kenya to explode the imagination of the Health Caretakers Training School in Kamweleni.

Internal: Surprise baby shower for Margaret Osundwa catches whole house off guard as Phase I hosts party in anticipation of adding to their growing ranks.

Contradiction: Developing systems of monitoring finances in order to unblock financial confusion. (Week 5)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Three hundred and seventy-seven register for the Kabiro Nursery School for this year, while the School Committee braces for even larger primary registration process next week. An invitation extended to active supporters for a Think-Tank on Kabiro's future. The Construction Guild moves into new contract organization with a contract for 20,000 blocks and 200 roofing panels from the coast butchery located right here in Kabiro.

Internal: Sam Were is sent out to teach the twelfth HDTI to be held in Kenya.

Contradiction: Making sure that the reorganization of the School and the construction guilds result in effective engagement rather than bankruptcy. (Week 2)

NAIROBI—THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Health Training with 132 people from the Section is held in Kangagi Sub-Location. Impact set up in North Tinire prepares 45 villages for VAM. VLEM is held in the South Tiriki location with 47 people who help with circuiting.

Internal: House in kinds supplies, one bundle of soap and two buckets for Section Project directors meeting with representatives from nine projects in the section.

Contradiction: Operating Programmes in the midst of funeral's implementation. (Week 3)

NAIROBI—THE MUGUMOINI HOUSE

External: Nthagaya Sub-Location says yes to becoming our first Cluster Project in Embu district. Mugumoini village is a lively place with a community center workday and a mobile clinic with 360 patients. Business begins for new staff with circuit training and health team getting right on the road.

Internal: New and old staff arrive to begin the Quarter and are impacted by fine shape of the House after three weeks of only two people.

Contradiction: Recreating our self story so that in the midst of being new we have permission to know what we know. (Week 1)

MOMBASA—THE KAMWELINI HOUSE

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: A visit by a representative of the Dutch government enables old leaders, S. Olatkes, Pundit Uthavun and Punlik Dangere to retell the story of Maliwada.

Internal: The House completes its quarterly planning with a celebration and decides to write one family from Maliwada to join in the weekly Roundtable. Maliwada leaders are taking turns to lead the Ashram collegiums starting with Punlik Dangere, on the Ambassadors Guild.

Contradiction: Articulating the new story that will allow people to participate in the work of Maliwada and the Cluster. (Week 2)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Cluster women, ICA staff and representatives of the Block Development Officer's staff form a team to orchestrate two Village Women's Meetings. Cluster women are told the story of grassroots development and their participation in it. The meetings feature a spin with visual displays on Care, Courage, Creativity and Corporateness. The meetings serve as pilots for doing women's events throughout the cluster using the existing structures.

Internal: Collegium series gets Ashram on top of Area Council resolves and launches us into Quarter III. The House celebrates the birth of Maruti and Dhorka Babhale's baby boy, born January 31 and weighing 2.7kg.

Contradiction: Making the Ashram into a strong net so it will catch big fish. (Week 5)*

BOMBAY—THE VAVIHARSH HOUSE

External: Medicine for the Vaviharsh Village is received from D.M.O. Nasik, and an authorisation letter comes for the Ghoti P.H.C. service. A film show about family planning and the Castisan village map is submitted to the Environmental Office.

Internal: A daily newspaper for the Ashrams is created.

Contradiction: Dealing with transportation problems in order that the Cluster visit can be on time. (Week 12)

PUNE—THE JAWALE HOUSE

External: Ashram holds first urban youth forum with social service class at Spicer Memorial College in Pune which creates a plan to take responsibility for the surrounding community. Global staff including a German, American and Indian lead an interglobal event with students from all over Asia and Africa. Mr. Dethew's new drawings for the Block Training Center arrive from Chandigar. Cluster survey team completes first week of intense data gathering from villages, taluka and district for Cluster documentation. Village leaders visit with Sham Kirloskar of Kirloskar Group in Pune results in imaginal spin about the application of the drip irrigation methods now used in Israel.

Internal: Ashram celebrates the annual Jawale Village Yatre(Fair) with invitations to homes, dramas, bhajan music, street dancing, lots of guests and lots of sweets. Rointon Setham and Mary Hopkins arrive back from Calcutta Imaginal Education series. Shekuntala Shrivasta celebrates fourth year in ICA and M. Mokale celebrates twentieth birthday.

Contradiction: Spacing maneuvers over time and expanding the engagement of the sectors so we can win. (Week 5)*

PUNE—THE MALE HOUSE

External: Five cement bags are donated by Nap Engineering to the Male Training Centre. A great meeting is held with Mr. Rathappa Kumbhar, the External Minister, at Ichalkaraiyee on the 23rd of December with the ICA staff and village leaders concerning the Male irrigation schemes actuation. Mehta and Mehta Company of Kolhepur donates one bicycle to the Male Ashram for Cluster work.

Internal: The water taker is supplied by L.P. to Male. Mr. Mukesh Taksadde works with us. Great House celebration is held on the 25th of December with two village guests.

Contradiction: (Week 12)

PUNE—THE BUDHODA HOUSE

External: A new bicycle is purchased. The circuit model (House to House visit) is put into use. The Health Department promises a film showing for the Cluster village.

Internal: The House enjoys a week of Roundtable, new room cleaning and decor, and the Khirismus festival Celebration.

Contradiction: Pushing the New Auxiliary and followup for "Good Internal Structures". (Week 12)

NAGPUR—THE SEVAGRAM HOUSE

External: Cluster survey compilations are completed. Agreement reached with new Nagpur Seva Bread agent. Request from women from four sectors leads to arrangement of first meeting of four sector women's guild.

Internal: Management trek comes along with cashiers and bookkeepers from other two bi-metros in Nagpur region. Magic show and Roundtable are great events. Ashram also hosts survey team of Ronnie Seagren and Heidi Holmes.

Contradiction: Finalizing the survey effectively so that we can move back into actuation teams. (Week 5)*

NAGPUR—THE TEMBURWAHI HOUSE

External: Ten bags of cement arrive for Panvel Cluster villages. Mahila Mandal president visits Khadi Village Industry and Village Bakery Factory. Dewada Information Officer has a site visit with a documentary film. Ashram got 10 bags cement for Ranveli Cluster Village. Three village tribal people (children) survey done. Temburwahi Mahila Mandal president visit to Khadi Village Industry for village Bakery Factory. Ashram gives the old record of Temburwahi CDA to Ballarpur Paper Mill Manager.

Internal: Ashram celebrates Makar Sankarnt festival and sends Area Team out. Collegium states future vision for Cluster actuation, Human Development Association and Chandra bi-metro. We celebrate the beginning of 1983 with a Makar Sankarnt festival in the Ashram. Ashram welcomes our new British colleagues from WCDS and receives IERD Spotlights and a letter from Sir James Lindsay from Brussels. A site visit from the information office Dewada includes a very effective documentary film show.

Contradiction: Coordinating time rhythms for actuation between village men and women and four-sector representatives. (Week 2)*

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

External: During the Cluster Consult, ten villages are visited, with the Dabhad villagers participating. In Digrus village 45 people took part in a workday. At the end of the Consult a 14 page document was produced in English and Marathi.

Internal: In preparation for the Consult, new lighting and decor are done in the Ashram, and eating utensils are secured. Representatives of the four sectors visits the House during the Consult.

Contradiction: Maintaining village participation during the cotton season. (Week 12)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: ICA, Gurgaon Gramin Bank and Canara Bank meeting in Lead Bank office clears the way for both banks to work in the Cluster. Managing Director of East India Cotton visits Cluster and offers training facilities for small textile printing industry. Visit to government electricity office requests street lighting in the Cluster villages.

Internal: Food storage and rubbish bins are procured and painted, inkind wood is transformed into E.G. furniture and a housing model is built.

Contradiction: Keeping all the plates spinning without dropping any. (Week 5)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Consult with two villages in Hyderabad Region creates a two year plan and sets up monthly Human Development Association meeting in the villages which involves villagers, YMCA, Lions Club, businessmen, local government people, Canara Bank and ICA. House inkind a brand new lady's bicycle to do village cluster. Development blitz secures 20 appointments and cash in hand.

Internal: The internal life of the House is geared up to sustain the external activity with a push on space care and on Roundtable excellence.

Contradiction: Experiencing an exponential growth in programme and a linear growth in staff. (Week 6)*

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Circuit to Ranchi Region confirms practics for Ranchi Rural Development Symposium and conducts training programme for Tata Steel community development, social welfare, family planning and rural development service. Formation strategies advance with both Education and Bustee Guilds meeting. Bustee economic ventures gain momentum with delivery of 43,400 plastic bags for the industry.

Internal: House symbolizes the end of the first month of the E.G. curriculum with a one-day outing and sends out Seth and Mary after a stay of three weeks for Imaginal Education curriculum.

Contradiction: Strategizing Quarter's schedule with multiple intangibles regarding troop configurations and programme commitments. (Week 5)*

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Sixty people from 15 nations participated in the Jakarta GRA, the first in this two year series, which opened with the Chairman and the Vice Chairman of the Board of ICA. Indonesia present and Professor Selo Sumarja, advisor to the president, giving the opening address. The Assembly was punctuated by two signal plenaries and two great celebrations--a disco and a sate feast. The Jakarta Think Tank results were mailed out; proposals for a total of US\$56,000 were submitted; and Jakarta Region hosted an area meeting on our government agreement relative to our work in Indonesia.

Internal: Another Global Language School gets underway a scant 36 hours after the request is made. The Panchayat does a collegium on HDZ in Latin America, North America and India.

Contradiction: Creating a model for how to keep programmatic activity going during Quarter III in an area and region during assignments to GLS in Surabaya, Pacific Training School, covering Medan priorship and working on the government agreement. (Week 11)

THE MEDAN HOUSE

External: Authorization nurture sees 12 copies of Quarterly Government Report in two languages distributed locally, nationally and internationally. Two Rural Development Directorate officials are briefed on the IERD and give consent for staff to accompany ICA on HDZ circuits. HDZ association meeting grows as justice department and military attend, lending their voices to a decision to write up the association's first one-year programme. HDZ implementation stepped up as new rational circuit model is launched with five circuits in five weeks to 15 desa villages and one keleurahan town.

Internal: Global Fast Day, a powerful event, includes «The Recession and It's Effect on the World's Poor». Sojourners join it for the first time and one of them fasts for the first time in his life. Roundtable is sober excitement as House gets acquainted with New Religious Mode charts and their relation to the «Second Turn in the World». A sojourn couple, both of whom are employed, is ready to move into the House bringing the sojourn program to six members.

Contradiction: Doing all the tasks in a week when assignments indicate few available troops. (Week 5)*

THE KUALA LUMPUR HOUSE

External: Visits to Bank Pembangunan confirm two modules. Two presentations are scheduled with Rotary and WCM. Letter is written to Home Affairs.

Internal: Office filing system becomes the symbol of a dramatic office. Carling returns for second visa extension. Roundtable study on "Post-Modern Mind" includes participation of two guests.

Contradiction: Prolonging campaign of materials preparation. (Week 5)*

THE UJUNG PANDANG HOUSE

External: A preschool in Kecamatan Maros Baru restarts with 30 children and three teachers. The new Camat(head of the Kecamatan) of Maros Baru is told the Bontoa story. The women's sewing class continues for second week with workshops on family budget for health and dietary needs.

Internal: Adrian renews his visa in Australia and Stovalls return from cancelled Global Language School to begin English classes for the staff.

Contradiction: Coordinating agency relations to allow for timely field implementation. (Week 3&4)*

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: Zamboanga team gets ready to leave as first up-front money arrives from Australia. Visit to Philippine Rural Reconstruction Movement (PRRM) headquarters and village project leaves everyone breathless at the imaginal leap in their economic development. Visit also allows creation of documentation model for future use by NSC Philippines.

Internal: House celebrates Philippine culture with a visit to a bamboo organ recital. Esmie Panat returns from Pacific Training School in Tonga and Anna Booth arrives.

Contradiction: Feeling the need for a "day stretcher" as possibilities for the future fill the normal week. (Week 6)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: The third executive guild meeting, held in the Hilton Hotel, was a great success with 14 members participating. Several new people showed up without recruitment from us. A visit from Hong Kong Council of Social Services provides key authorization body in Hong Kong and a potential cosponsor for Hong Kong's local symposium.

Internal: For lunar new year prep we cleaned the whole house, got new office furniture, watched the superbowl game and had a celebration with a special dinner. On lunar new year day the House visited the Nexus to see the fireworks and went to see E. T.

Contradiction: Figuring out the effective implementation of development strategy for February. (Week 6)*

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Excellent visits with top government officials solidify support for the IERD. Schedule is set for a four-day tour of the Government's demonstration villages all across the island, with the council for Agricultural Planning and Development providing staff and mini-bus for ICA staff and members of the Steering Committee. First of a series of supervisors' training sessions is done for a major management training center in Taipei.

Internal: House hosts the new David Hutcheon's family briefly on their way to Nam Wai, welcomes Global trekker Kevin Grady from Boston and celebrates the return of Rebecca Grow from the faculty of Tonga P.T.S.

Contradiction: Building the systems that allow us to follow through properly on our priority arenas, while maintaining the flexibility to respond quickly to unexpected openings. (Week 5)

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Joel Robinson and Bob King from Los Angeles visit Putsan and tour the beautified ceramic soil crusher and poultry industry and community administration office building. The tour was highlighted by preschool children who demonstrated singing and reading the alphabet. Nursery garden planted eight mangoes and six jackfruit seedlings and propagated cabbage, pechay, chili, eggplant, tomato, and string beans for community nutrition. The Putsan House and Manila House staff estimate proposed budget of Putsan expansion.

Internal: House planning includes a study of the social process triangles, organizational charts, cooperative operation and spirit life guide for the new staff. Week was highlighted by celebrating the 19th birthday of the new intern Purification Condat and the arrival of Vicky Aguirang from Manila House for audit preparation.

Contradiction: Finding effective strategy for training local staff to be in charge of cluster expansion around Tiwi. (Week 5)

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: Sudtonggan becomes beautiful for Mactan 24 Health Fair. Pig marketing and Sudtonggan Co-op marketing seem to be the first step toward the future. The week is highlighted with Bankal Dental Clinic and Bagong Dalan mothers class.

Internal: Sudtonggan staff work day in Sudtonggan chapel prepares for Sunday Mass celebration. Staff picked up 15 sacks of calboro for workday and Fred and Daliny are sent to Zambolanga to prepare for consult.

Contradiction: Focussing the social and economic development in Mactan 24 and coming Mactan 24 Health Fair. (Week 7)*

THE DAVAO HOUSE

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: Layout and writing for first newsletter is begun; invitations to first N.S.C. meeting are mailed. Advisors meeting beckons colleagues to new opportunities of service through IERD, Philippine Work Camp, Newsletter and Roundtable. Task force lays out 12 week curriculum for women's program and development brings in Y300,000.

Internal: New jobs are secured at YWCA and replacement agency and negotiations continue for upgrading present salaries to maintain momentum to 12 stipends.

Contradiction: Building the story that translates IERD to a significant event for Japan and not a remote conference in India. (Week 6)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Under the banner of "Turning Winter Into Spring" the number of solid recruits for the Rural Development Symposium two weeks hence went from three to 33. This was achieved through visits to The Office of Rural Development, UNICEF, Community Development Foundation and the Institute for Saemaul Studies, all of which decided not only to participate but to have a member on the National Steering Committee.

Internal: Mr. Lee Jung Min (not to be confused with Lee Jung Min at Chicago Nexus) was recieved as second intern for the year. Also we welcomed Mr. Lee Sang Ryang as sojourner.

Contradiction: Developing a financial base which provides a lot more than not quite enough. (Week 5)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: The Cheong Ju House creates HDZ guilds for Phase I and HDZ maneuver time line.

Internal: The House has a celebration on Lunar New Year's day with rice-cake and green pea pancakes.

Contradiction: Trying on a new outfit of operating in guild structures without having a strong zipper. (Week 6)*

THE FUKUOKA HOUSE

External: February's goal of 20 IERD calls is half finished; 95 visits with individuals and agencies produce other names for future calls. Two Regional Team Members are invited to attend a JC meeting where 180 hear a 5-minute report on the ICA Town Meetings. A 13-week Human Development Education Course is set for Quarter four.

Internal: Jean Hansen has a new class member; a local TV station Vice President who is the only executive in his company who speaks English. Twenty four hours of Language Lab teaching helps the budget.

Contradiction: Projecting ourselves practically and boldly into the future to do what we said we would do. (Week 6)*

THE OSAKA HOUSE

External: Our second English Intensive Workshop scores a big hit with the 17 (paying) participants, plus House, attending the 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. event, pointing to an authentic program thrust for the future. Advisor Mark Reames and Board member Oku involved in IERD and circuit calls, respectively. Initial IERD calling opens up new possibilities with NGO's (Non-governmental organizations) network in Third World Development.

Internal: House celebrates sojourner Iwao Omai's 20th birthday with cake and ice-cream. "First birthday party I've ever had". A visit to an old friend and advisor, living near former residence, Mr. Murakami, renews valued relationship.

Contradiction: Co-ordinating finances in face of seeing the victory locally while dealing with management systems located elsewhere. (Week 6)*

THE SAPPORO HOUSE

External: Government sponsored Town Meeting circuit in Aomori Prefecture has a new image as ICA staff is driven from one town to another in black limosenes. We are received by mayors and planning groups as community consultants, and work with them on specific issues. Machiko Horuichi gets paid writer's fee for publicizing ICA programs in the newspaper.

Internal: Mr. Uchigashima gives exciting report on his trip to Indian Houses and Chikhale project. He wears longi and Karta, and serves Indian tea while showing slides and telling the story.

Contradiction: Being patient as program directors come into focus but aren't yet clear enough to timeline the details. (Week 4)

AREA SYDNEY

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: E.P.V.Y. LENS held January 24th-26th with 25 key people in Trans-Education programmes in northern part of city. Perth Regional Team reports that two shires in the Western Wheat belt are interested in adopting a village in India and training farmers, following Rural Development Symposiums attended by Esme Park, Liza Tod and John Rader. Area council hosted by Melbourne Region includes representatives from all six Regions. Plans are made for Inter Region Programme blitz and circuiting models and self-support strategies are consensed upon.

Internal: Adam Thompson is sent out to teach global lanugage school in Indonesia. Paul Thompson and Daniel Bellamy begin formal Schooling and House search is intensified as we prepare to welcome the Jim and Karen Newkirk family.

Contradiction: While Internal Support foundations are shaking missional cannon cannot be focussed on target. (Week 5)

SYDNEY-THE MURRIN BRIDGE HOUSE

External: Text is complete for second Ngiyampaa Language Book and work begins on illustrations.

Internal: Working with mothers on making school uniforms gains the House meat, a bicycle tyre and other goodies.

Contradiction: Overcoming summer and drought produced lethargy with new futuric images. (Week 6)*

THE PERTH HOUSE

External: Methods for Teamwork is held with 20 around the table, using a construct combining methods, spirit and vocational reflection. Several programme requests for the next Quarter come from the participants.

Internal: The House is enlivened by the presence of Christina Clark and Barry Oakley, and does several collegiums on the Academy, the Training Centre dynamic and IERD.

Contradiction: Keeping the transition momentum going for 4 more weeks. (Week 11)

THE MELBOURNE HOUSE

External: Follow-up to East Preston (Education Programme for Unemployed Youth) and Edgells (company) LENS produce recommendation letter and two more possible LENS each. IERD packet inviting NSC members to launch meeting is sent to 37 people.

Internal: The Newkirk family arrives in Melbourne to take up new assignment as Rob Duffy departs for Sydney. Facility search takes on new edge with 4:00 a.m. visit to upstairs tenant as he arrives home from work, and appointment with Julian Slattery from the Jesuits.

Contradiction: Pursuing all missional advantages while necessary energy is channelled toward Housing the troops. (Week 6)*

AREA SUVA

THE APIA HOUSE

External: Roundtable shifts images from training to Guild building and all are impacted by panelist's cynicism on development possibilities. First workday on Training Center removes kitchen floor, replaces kitchen roof, removes three walls and bamboo wall covering in clouds of dust.

Internal: House does workshop on local self-support with new intern possibilities and reviews common memory papers. Henry Beverly arrives and Fetw'u is received as a local intern.

Contradiction: Building clear strategies for future directions to cover what is going on in both Tonga and Area. (Week 6)*

AREA SAN FRANCISCO

THE LOS ANGELES HOUSE

External: Ten days of victorious whirlwind begins with the U.S. National Steering Committee gathering 50 strong--in L.A. for initial session. They celebrate decision to do IERD at Dr. Marwah's palatial Malibu ranch, where Norman Jewison impacts all with praise. Rural Development Symposium: Western States happens in Tulare County with 32 displaying organizations, computerized registration, 130,000 farmers, a beautiful tent, lots of media coverage, and 75 full timers in the workshops. Tulare County as emerging HDZ is seen at every turn. Finally Area Council occurs in LA as IERD is seen as the one task we are all about this year.

Internal: Hosting 109 people in ten days in three different locations happens with surprising but hard won finesse.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on advantages of NSC/RDS as we "get back to normal" and face the challenge of self-support. (Week 6)

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: A Roundtable with more new people finds practical work doing collective research on world development trends a helpful pull-together of the research so far. A Team planning day does wave analysis on trends of history, reflects on strategy and commitment through the movie of GANDHI and engages in significant conversation about the remaining task of the program year. GANDHI addresses all as a profound encounter with life of surrender, freedom and commitment, and empowers poetry of the day during the planning task.

Internal: A visit of Carin, Aaron and Jason Boone for three days while Carin attends the Physicians Assistants Conference for continuing education credit, stretches child care practics.

Contradiction: Keeping courage to stay at the depth achieved during Saturday planning. (Week 4)

THE PHOENIX HOUSE

External: The region meets to plan Quarter III, and celebrate the visit of Kim and Chris Epley on their way to Guatemala. The two-day circuit of the Tucson Metro includes the first of possibly eight two-hour Imaginal Education workshops with Lutheran Elementary School; three more RDS displays and confirmation of fourth NSC member from region. The Youth Cluster shares the Pisinemo slide show with class at Central High School.

Internal: Self-support moves ahead as Nina receives first Baskin-Robbins paycheck and House is hired to do property maintenance while John McAdam and Nathan's room is completed and Don Barkoney moves into "rear condominium" for a week.

Contradiction: Creating a consensus on task priorities and configurations. (Week 2)

THE DENVER HOUSE

External: Letters to Region Rotary Clubs elicit first invitation same week. Lt. Governor of Colorado on NSC refers us to her Minnesota counterpart. Preparation for VJL and urban programs, is given form in a Week II Strategy Session. Denver National Steering Committee members lunch at House and layout letterhead and plans to contact more projects. Andy Mair gives presentation on Afghanistan to 28.

Internal: Sojourners Laurie Ure and Akio Kajatani enliven House during week of sending five to Youth Symposium and celebrating with pizza and TV movie at Wrights.

Contradiction: Maintaining long range perspective while expending every ounce to ensure quality events. (Week 7)*

AREA EDMONTON

THE EDMONTON HOUSE
