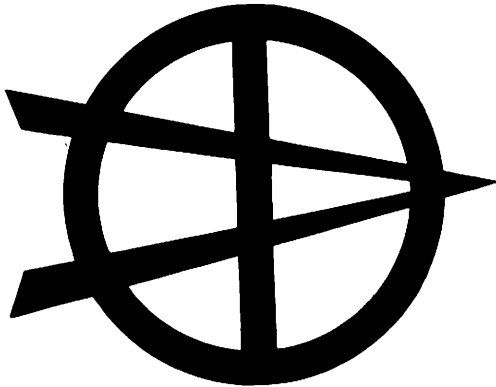

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Iberian Academy gains momentum as brochures are mailed, faculty and participant manuals are completed, and all necessary translation is done. Combined Academy Recruitment and Multi Community Development Site Trek is launched to four areas for ten days. Ministry of Trabajo check arrives at long last for 1.7 million pesetas (over \$10,000), representing Spanish Government subvention of ICA operating expenses.

Internal: Revolving door of Continental Council/site trek first swell, then shrink House presence, as J. Campbell, Schjrinens, Marcia, and Cathy sit down to celebrate L. Ferguson's birthday with whole Area present.

Contradiction: Creating a structure for the week which will enable six days output to happen in three, despite having only a few people. (Week 1)

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: The Iberian Academy becomes a reality and 17 from the Montemuro are recruited from nine different villages, the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Social Affairs. IERD Phase III event in Mezio hosts 100 people in the House to a slide show on India with people standing in the kitchen and outside to hear the story.. Scholarships for the IERD are approved from the Lamego County Council, the District Governor, Sumoe Soft Drinks, the Dao Wine Cooperative, the bishop of Lamego, and Dr. Ilidio Fernandes.

Internal: Nightly collegiums of MFTF with Ken Hamje, our 84 year old landlord, and two German friends of Klaus cycling through cause late-night excitement awe and wonder. Cathy and Paul leave for recruitment/House visit to Madrid.

Contradiction: Going all out on the local to enable the Iberian Academy to happen while getting inside necessary internal shifts out of the MFTF. (Week ?)*

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: A Volunteer Orientation Weekend of 18 people including one couple is the first in which all participants ask for placements, seven of them for one year. A trend of older, employed people looking for meaningful engagement emerges. Connie and Joe visit 14 Orders in Ireland and enjoy Irish hospitality and \$6,450 in working money in one week as the first of several Continental funding manoeuvres using the European Order network.

Internal: Jon Considine and Patrice Vrona celebrate their new family in a swirl of singing and dancing and leave for a Lake District honeymoon as the sun and tourists (paying guests) emerge.

Contradiction: Focusing on several priorities and intending to give all maximum attention. (Week 2)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: "Funding Strategies for the Rural Poor" statement from the IERD is translated into French and sent to other Houses with Francophone constituency, along with official French version of the Development Forum article. Desmond contributes a paper and a speech to the Council of Europe's Seminar on Orwell's 1984. Beverley prepares document on Europe-Eurasia Council, highlight is set of development manoeuvres to take advantage of IERD documentation for fund-raising. Jean-Baptiste Bougouma, formerly secretary of ICA France, invites ICA co-operation with the new African Organization for Development and Exchange, which unites people from several African countries to work to return the value of the human factor in economic, social and cultural development in Africa.

Internal: Team works on proposal for an urban research programme which will unite UNESCO research, learnings from other urban experiences (Copenhagen for example) and local La Courneuve (our neighbourhood) community activity and reflection. Families of Basil Sharp and Tracy Longacre widen Paris horizons to include West Virginia, New Jersey (USA) and the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Deciding when and how to join the computer age by getting some hardware. (Weeks 13-3)

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Attendance at the workshop on Participative Methods sponsored by the German Foundation for International Development by ICA gave an opportunity to plan how to teach cooperative leaders attending a July Conference how to handle participative methods, to learn and to share methods we have used. Returned delegates and members of the Steering Committee met (April 12,13) to hear reports, see slides and begin targeting audiences and media for further reports. Continental Council was attendanded by Houses.

Internal: Connie and John on the road again--Connie to London to help with Religious Order calls and John to Rome to begin writing first draft of the IERD report book. House plans quarter taking into account all the claims from the MFTF and the Continental Council.

Contradiction: Adjusting to heavier demands of this quarter financially (Self-Support, ICA, and IERD payables) and struggling to determine the key actions to keep the advantages of the IERD preparation moving to the future. (Week 13)

AREA ROME

External: The group finished the first sample pamphlet on IERD, "Rural Economic and Commercial Development". At the same time the crew created plans to research publishers, printers and to send to consultants for advice around the world. Bill Salmon and Judin Tippett arrived and the Pope waved at Joe Crocker.

Internal: The House moved from two teams--book and Rome House--to a single taskforce using wordprocessing 24 hours a day as we received five thesis to type for self-support in addition to everything else.

Contradiction: Moving into the chute with 300 pages of IERD pamphlets and 200 pages of theological thesis to turn out this week. (Week 3)*

External: New Delhi report draws nine colleagues to the House; eight day Council at Brussels for Continents Europe and Eurasia continue the visioning and strategizing for these in Year of Order Council; Volunteer Orientation Weekend is held with three participants (a first in Austria) with help of returned German Volunteer Inge Kruspel.

Internal: Paul St. John, nephew of Wendall St. John, visits a few days to see Vienna. Austrian Bureaucracy is very much intact after waiting for one month for third inspector for gas heating stove who takes five minutes to turn heater on and off, sends certificate of approval and \$60.00 bill next day.

Contradiction: Working with the ambiguity of the "no longer and not yet" as reflected in society and our own perception of what it means to be responsible. (Week 1)

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: A series of consults with Esso Corporation is completed and the income received allows us to see a light at the end of our financial tunnel.

Internal: Six months of back telephone bills are paid and a working telephone is celebrated by all.

Contradiction: No direction or clues to directions we need to take forward the summer and Order Council preparation leave us experiencing a vacuum in this arena! (Week 3)*

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Full Area Council wrestles with demand for special manoeuvres and assigning new project directors as a result of the demands of the GRA and GOC. Short term volunteers and Kenyan faculty spend a day to write proposals for future volunteer orientation and field training. New model is created to focus engagement of trained village leaders after they return to their villages after training schools.

Internal: Area celebrates the arrival of Jescah Bukutsa Ndinda Ikatukhu born to Elinah and Henry Ikatukhu in Nairobi on 9 April, 1984 weighing 2.7 kilograms.

Contradiction: Unravelling the complexity of the quarter requiring special field manoeuvres, a full health survey, Coast Community Centre completion and full circuits and village leaders training while shifting to new leadership responsibility in the field. (Week 2)

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: The first two community rabbit hutches are completed and four rabbits delivered as part of the family protein supplement in addition to the intensive garden plot scheme which is literally overflowing Kabiro in all directions. The E.G. survey camp reconfirms the grid. The clinic does a day's training for 50 local midwives and shows a family planning film series for youth. Our solar panels are now giving power to the clinic lights and the refrigerator.

Internal: The new Kabiro Team moves to new housing space, new collegium room, new painted walls and decor, while hosting seven new village movement staff passing through to new assignments four who were working on visas to go to Chicago and four trying to adjust their movement forces' assignments.

Contradiction: The community is afraid of the Kabiro family's demand that all project facilities and family units unrelated to the Kabiro family move off the land by July. (Week 4)*

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: Maliwada is gripped by election fever as 38 candidates contest the membership of the first ever separate (not shared with Danlatabad) Gram Panchayat. The campaigning went on amidst a swirl of activity as 25 new houses are constructed, 15 couples are married, a new pawn shop and laundry opens and Dr. Ambedkar's (author of India's Constitution) birthday is celebrated with lectures and all-night bhajan (music).

Internal: The Regional Training Week is diversified to include a Management Trek, Regional Budget and planning, and blitzing the construction of Chikhale Cluster's Lonivali Preschool. The discovery of a robbery on the Teams return to Maliwada House heightens awareness for tighter security, and Regional Team, Ben and Kokane assist in house cleaning, gardening as Ramesh is sent out to a self-support sign-writing contract at Panvel.

Contradiction: Adjusting to an ICA team of one person working closely with cluster villagers and three sectors. (Weeks 1,2)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Week begins with Lonivale site visit from Germau Consul to see preschool they funded two years ago. The were hosted in grand style and offered to send funds for final plastering of building. Ambar Charka Women's Industry reopens and celebrates sanction of Rs20,000 loan. Twenty-three villagers (7 villages) spend first day of (PJL) PDL looking at social change, future directions, community organizations, participating and learnings and where human development has taken place. The highlight of the day was context created by villagers toward self reliance "give us two years to be fully trained and then you (ICA) can go!" (1). Regional Team is all in Chikhale for final week of building Lonivale preschool which demands many troops and long hours. Management Trek allows the Region to work through vouchers of nine months and sets us on the track for the future. Ashram training is initiated with English classes taught daily by volunteers (13). Chikhale Ashram participates in great Area Council leaving two people as continuity in cluster. HOLI festival holds celebrative dynamic of the week with colourfoul powder and water covering everyone; singing and dancing being the action mode of the day. Plans for next four months including GRA/GOC thrusts us into a time of intensive staff training, self support, development and preparation for the next 16 years (12).

Internal: Quarter planning gives permission for fine quarter celebration with four guests from management and operations. Sent two out to NST and welcomed Kalenkar from Maliwada. Landlord's plan to house guests in Ashram creates need to re-locate seven house people and remove reed mat partitions for 12 days (1). Passport application writing becomes a celebration as all struggle with questions and answers that will allow us to move globally (13).

Contradiction: Holding the tension between the critical staff training, GOC prep and being drawn to new possibilities in the cluster and block. Experiencing the fear and fascination that global travel releases and knowing the practical steps needed to get "all" of us to GRA/GOC. Experiencing anticipation and burden of the next four months. (Weeks 12,13,1)

External: This week the appropriate technology project of the Dutch volunteers is becoming practical and a PDL has been made of the Jawale HDP.

Internal: We sent two staff members out to the New Skills Training School in Poona. New people arrived including two British volunteers. They will teach the staff English in preparation for Chicago.

Contradiction: Strategic Order transition movements and politics block us in our block work, at-work, English classes and Chicago preparations. (Week 1)

External: Forty Area Madras participants return from the Central International Event with regional plans for Phase III implementation. Thirty-five villagers from four cluster villages sign up for technical skills training under Government scheme. ICA participate in Annual General Meeting of the Federation of Voluntary Organisations in Karnataka, of which five organisations participated in the Central International Event.

Internal: Samson and Wankhede and Mary Hampton are sent out for New Skills Training, and extraordinary self support. House receives volunteers from the UK and Australia.

Contradiction: Consensing on the activities and spirit mode that will sustain the diverse gathering of people currently in the ashram, in a time of great transition and unreconciled polarities. (Week 2)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Invitations are prepared for up-coming HD1. Bustee local Committee deliver uniforms to Liptons. Report for IGS.S.S. sponsors is made. An associate (Antoinette) agrees to teach sewing skills to Howrah women.

Internal: This week, Prtidan came back, we heard when Vaughn will arrive from Brussels. The landlord called Sheila in to talk and we all went to see "Char ek Mandir" a Hindi film and the 'Year of Order Council' came back from being framed.

Contradiction: Bringing off a great event in a facility not geared to being a training centre. (Week 2)

AREA SINGAPORE

THE JAKARTA HOUSE

External: Two LENS, with National Sugar Board in Jakarta and PTP VL (Plantation Company) in Pabatu North Sumatra. Three Global Language Schools for one sugar company is completed and report written. Team of IERD Phase III trek returns from Sumatra Island, Medan Bengkulu, and Palembang to give a report to the Local Steering Committee on the Central Event. Another team leaves for Ujung Pandang South Sulawesi.

Internal: Neat family takes a trip to Jokjakarta after three GLSS are completed. Rich Mackay is sent out to Chicago.

Contradiction: Participate in thinking through of YOC besides doing the task and with people continually in and out. (Week 3)*

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: House hosts Lyn and Bill Edwards and Mrs. Basham on their arrival in the Philippines. Eighty invitations are sent out for the IERD workshop Phase III. Toon Wauters gives the house a collegium on his journey and reflections with the ICA in the Netherlands and the Philippines (3). Manila House holds its area trek thus completing the orientation for all the Houses for the YOC. The first draw of the Putsan grant is received from PGI. Thirty-nine invitation letters for the Tiwi Think Tank is sent, and an invitation for a luncheon talk with Pasig Rotary leads to an invitation for a one day LENS. La Tondena says yes to printing inkind stationary for the ICA (2).

Internal: Easter Discontinuity makes a short working week, Don and Claudia spend their time in Baguio while Nick Barker takes photographs of the local Easter tradition of crucifixions the rest stay home and play scrabble (3). Evenings are full with the House beginning its initial work on geo/social gridding and Roundtable in the form of a Song-Fest with parlour games and tugs-of-war. Mike Hoff drops by for one night on his way back to Hong Kong from Sydney, and Jesse junior begins to recover from measles (2).

Contradiction: Taking care of the hardware (telephone malfunctions xrox disabilities, computer printer death, men's dorm asphyxiation) that we can then move into dealing with the software. Maintaining our priorities in face of the immediate mundane matters that beset us daily. (Weeks 2,3)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

External: Medical Health Department has approved 3-year lease for the facility. Union Oil Grant is approved for second time and YOC visa/travel report forms are in computer. All set to go!!

Internal: House celebrates Jim Fenton's 52nd birthday with finest dessert after the weekly ritual. House warmly rewelcomes Mrs. Bassham, Lyn and Mike from China tour.

Contradiction: Keeping a chastity of focus on YOC in the midst of many details. (Week 2)

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: (Another) dinner with our illustrious Prof. Wu, this time with the Chairman of the Fruit Coop and others, elicits comment from Gordon, "Our colleagues would never believe this is marketing!" Corvetine sends \$NT 80,000 (\$2,000US), first development money of the new month. Visit to Silo (See-low) Farmers Association with National Taiwan University Agricultural Extension colleague begins RDS recommended linked pilot project discussions.

Internal: House and close colleagues do six-month planning session, including discussion on possible for-profit consultancy organization. House brainstorms "gaps" in first collegium on Economic Foundations Model.

Contradiction: Being asked to sing when your mouth is full. (Week 1)

MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: A bank account is opened as a last requirement for the PHDP turnover and a partnership meeting, involving government developments, representatives from the private sectors and concerned individuals is held in the municipal building to talk about, and set a date for the PHDP expansion think tank. While we are still looking for the trainer of tailoring class session. The ICA staff had already created different models for each economic venture like in poultry, ceramic, demonstration farm and Coop store and now we are using it. They had already finished making training curriculum for the Health Aid/Preschool Aid. The Guild workers assist the ICA staff to design a model for the 2nd year PHDP anniversary this coming May 11, 1984 and to be presented to the Barangay officials. The Health Care taker completed the Community diagnosis chart making for the year 1983-1984 to be submitted to the municipal development office.

Internal: Joselito Bensi Celebrates his 27th birthday anniversary on April 8th, we have a short celebration program in the House with one gallon of ice-cream, soft drinks and cakes. Quarter IV planning is done with specific activities to keep the staff moving. Week 1, we welcomed bask Vickie from the trek. She spent three days in Cebu and two days in Mahayag. On April 7, Don Cramer and Jesse Navarete arrive from Manila to co-ordinate workshop on Life Education, the Panchayat, Family Individual Declaration, Future Strategies for the Philippines and is participant in the Tiwi Expansion Meeting with members from public and private sectors.

Contradiction: Giving the full turn over of PHDP to Barangay council was hard try in midst of moving to MCD was more challenging. (Week 3)*

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: A Health meeting is set up in the office of the Ministry of Education Culture and Sports which is attended by some doctors of the City of Lapu-Lapu and doctor from the town of Cordova. Development calls/appointments and follow up is done.

Internal: We have a visitor from the United Church of Christ in the Philippines (UCCP) with around one hundred people and the visit of Lyn and Bill Edwards and Marian Bassham. House celebration during the Holy Thrusday, Friday and all the members going to anywhere they want to go, some of the staff going to the church. Council on May and June - a preparation for the July and August Global Council Plenary.

Contradiction: Trooping Cebu Region in getting the monthly quota for July/August travel. (Week 3)*

DAVAO-LANGUB

DAVAO-MAHAYAG

External: Drainage workday at Delusom Community Well removes pool of stagnant water; two folks with one shovel involves eight others. Four Ministry of Agriculture instructors teach one-day seminar; two citizens become caretakers of new breeding stock to upgrade pigs and chickens in the project. Educational aid arrives; two boxes of books from Asia Foundation.

Internal: ICA staff participate in the Compound Fiesta, Steve and Nening join in the sports; Carling wins at the cock fight; all feast with the hospitable citizens. Carling receives driver's license and Efen teaches driving.

Contradiction: Motivating the Auxiliary in new directions through contextual methods. (Week 3)*

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: Brochure of second Volunteer Symposium in Japan, the first in Tokyo, is mocked up for June 24th. Membership renewal letters are sent along with an invitation in a Philippine Work Camp report meeting on May 16th. Two sojourners indicate plans to attend summer program in Chicago.

Internal: Model Building Taskforce assignment is completed in an intensive week-long push, a week also fulfilled by remarkable witnesses by sojourners and an eventful English cooking class led by chef David Reese.

Contradiction: Continually keeping ourselves wired into the entire Council which is now in process across the entire globe. (Week 4)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: The House visited Sunkyung Company for LENS marketing and researched Medium Industry Association for LENS. The House started to create Korean LENS brochure. The House practiced orientation for Tabitha Eichler who was from England as a volunteer. She visited Korean family, and learned Korean custom and culture.

Internal: The House has a meditation time every morning, invited a Buddhist Monk from their main temple (headquarters) to hear about Buddhism, and visited one Buddhist training center (one means circle, it isn't a sect of Buddhism) in order to learn their concepts, training methods where we sat in on one Buddhist meditation.

Contradiction: (No contradiction submitted) (Week 2)

External: The team has a steering committee meeting with 11 people on the 13th of April. The team has a subcounty general secretaries Meeting with 10 subcounties on the 15th of April. Funding visits were done for R.D.S and the team visited villages to discern successful cases.

Internal: House members travel to Seoul to participate in sending Leonard Hockley to Chicago for the Continuum.

Contradiction: Thinking that there is time tomorrow to do today's task. (Week 2)

Internal: Lyn Wisman is here helping with development while Mary Lyn Oyler's parents visit and House takes computer classes.

Contradiction: Rapidly dealing with immediate implementaries in order to be able to focus on strategies setting us up for September. (Week 3)

THE DENVER HOUSE

External: Methods Module Series elicits enthusiastic participation from 11 new people; letter from the governor officially confirms his support for Colorado Exposition of Rural Development, underway at full steam!

Internal: Spirit events abound with the completion of summer spirit life model and announcement of birth of John Paul Springs to Kate and Bob.

Contradiction: Staying on the critical path in all five Colorado Exposition arenas while effectively recruiting four other major events. (Week 4)*

AREA EDMONTON

THE EDMONTON HOUSE

External: Five paid registrations come in for June Conference in Albert; 23 letters are sent out to Manitoba government departments for June event. Final push is made to complete model-building assignment.

Internal: Guradian family invites House to dinner with members of the Madonna House Apostolate, a community of laypersons working in the inner city of Edmonton: collegiality is created over singing movement songs.

Contradiction: Telling a story that pushes through agency referrals to get to the local project practitioners. (Week 4)*

AREA HOUSTON

THE HOUSTON HOUSE

External: Intensive push on building our assigned Cycle II model for Multi-Community Catalysis Approach ends a 3-week marathon of glorious expenditure, giving all participants a profound respect for models of the sister houses in our "set" before they arrive in our mailbox! Staff is dispersed to Mississippi for the RDS, to Dallas for collegial gathering and to Oklahoma and Louisiana for development and YOC visits.

Internal: Brooke Tippett goes "on tour" with high school professional class chorale. House ends model building with Mexican American happy hour presentation of the finished MCC model, ready to be sent around the globe.

Contradiction: Utilizing the contextual transformation wrought by intensive model building for the globe to inform pre-Council implementation of previously built tri-regional strategy. (Week 4)*

THE DALLAS HOUSE

THE MEMPHIS HOUSE

External: "Blue Blood" development team follow'up on call which produces challenge to match a \$10,000 certificate of deposit with completed programs and initiates strategy and commitment to get inside World Affairs Council and international community. MRDS team is home and phones to many potential participants from TM and SSS days. House dives into spirit modes model building by emerging ourselves in spectacular evening contexting sessions with Ritual Process Paper, "The One, the Many and the Few" and Mathew Fox's "Original Blessing".

Internal: House Dodge is stolen while Zahrt does gig on Beale Street, and then miraculously is returned within a day.

Contradiction: Establishing a starting point out of all the contexts we've created on spirit modes that will allow us to build models in concert while in dispersion. (Week 2)

THE ATLANTA HOUSE

External: House participates in Dean Johnson's installation as vicar of St. Simon's Church. Rod and Eric cover the Carolina's in a circuit which sees 22 people and continues the process of Sharing Approaches That Work.

Internal: Economic Foundations Model pull together shares wisdom of regional colleagues, Joe Cleft and Joe Thomas as well as suggestions from colleagues through letters and phone calls.

Contradiction: Winding up the year's do's while the clock is running out. (Week 4)*

AREA CHICAGO

THE CHICAGO HOUSE

External: Fifth City Business Careers (FCBC) submits budget proposal for year beginning July 1, 1984 to the Mayor's Office of Employment and Training. Site visits to 5th City are made by Indonesian NSC member, Dahwn Rahawa and Jim Bevel, formal civil rights leader, who is currently running for Congress from the 7th District on Republican ticket. The new clerical training program funded by North Cook Co. PIC (Private Industry Council), named Office of the Future, graduates second class of trainees (4). Three more public schools on the Westside are ready for WPC (Westside Planning Consultation), as the core of community leaders form a stronger bond as they come together for the third lab of the OFT (Organization Facilitators Training) in the Northwest Communities. Seaway Bank finally closes loan so the parts store of the 5th City Auto Center can place its first order of supplies. Levar Burton, the black actor who played Kunta Kinte in "Roots" visits the young actors in the 5th City Cultural Club (3).

Internal: Terry Bergdall and Karen Troxel present their talking papers at morning collegiums on HDZ probes on work on Westside and Northwest Communities (4). Whole House participates in the work on the Order Training Format, the strategic arena assigned the House. Bill Salmon celebrates 50th birthday early before he is sent out to Rome to help with the book (3).

Contradiction: Clarifying our HDZ learnings in preparation for the Continental HDZ Lab. (Weeks 3,4)

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE

Internal: House celebrates Easter week by, at the beginning three members joining local church David and Burna Dunn and also Mark Rebstock and week is celebrated with an Easter egg hunt and dispersment to discontinuity.

Contradiction: Creating scheduling and communication systems that allow life in the "fast track". (Week 3)*

LORIMOR HDP

External: Iowa focus proposal is submitted to Hy Vee Food Chain Foundation by Gene Smith, colleague banker from Indianola. A.M. Novel and two house members embark on church trek that nets \$1,000 in one week for the Year of Order Council and 3rd world partnership monies promised. The churches manifest a new openness for participation in the Order: Ecumenical and the 3rd world. Dick West is sent to be part of the team for the Mississippi RDS.

Internal: Stan and Anita Fry, Peter's parents, visit the house for a day and express their deep collegueship and deep care about the Order, reminding us that we wouldn't be here without colleagues like them and their continual support.

Contradiction: Getting local financial commitment which would symbolize Iowa's commitment to being a demonstration of human development. (Week 4)*

The same day, Susan Brainard leads a dynamite workshop for Cooperative Extension professionals in northern New York State; workshop, on strengthening 4-H adult leadership, was built by Susan and Regional Team colleagues. April 17, Ellen and Bob Mayo travel to Poughkeepsie, where Neil Sinclair has gathered a dozen people to dialogue with the Approaches That Work Video (from IERD) and talk seriously about interchange needs of agencies within their county.

Sixty participants from Guatemala, Honduras and Mexico came through three weeks as 100% strongly trained leaders. The DOOP model (CHUPP) done in Week II construct for first time in Latin America. Final Week II Assembly started off with a RACIMO (new word for cluster) Community Forum and ended with a six month maneuver timeline for the RACIMO GUSTATOYO for four municipalities with 15 villages in the State of El Progreso, Guatemala. Brand new construct used emphasizing flow and practical application of modules using the nine arenas of responsibility. The participants are ready to work!!

Internal: Highly excited Juan and Rocio are sent out to their new internship in Lima House and reassigned Thomas and Hans to Guatemala. Three days are spent building new water system, kitchen, fence, collegium room and procured three room house for RACIMO office for new Guatemala House in Conacaste. Then ended week with Area Council and timeline for next five months. Mexico will fly nine people to July Council.

Contradiction: Starting all over again in Mexico. (Week 3)*

Contradiction: Creating a structure for the week which will enable six days output to happen in three, despite having only a few people. (Week 1)

External: Thirteen participants are sent off to Iberian Academy in Avila, Spain, including village team, Ministry of Agriculture and social workers. The President of the Camara provides a bus for ten days. Village festival celebrates 50 years of Rural Catholic Action with songs, dances and stories, and speech by Monsenor Ilidio, how ICA is key to the future.

Internal: Stefan's baptism is celebrated with village and family. House triples in size as 4 Schrijnan family, 4 Armas family and Jane Sharp visit for Easter.

Contradiction: Working out how relations are maintained as staff change. (Week 4)*

External: IERD delegates present debriefing at Commonwealth Institute to the public. They agree on future role as public speakers using U.K. exhibit, it raises the question of ICA role and strategy in rural development in U.K. Sir Eric Norrio (ex High Commissioner to Kenya, India and Malaysia) agrees to be patron of Village Volunteer Service Programme.

Internal: Self-support in hostelry hits bonanza - three Zimbabweans plus one Japanese come in as paying guests for three months. Continent raises all but \$1,000 for projected self-support expectations. During our first month of continental release point.

Contradiction: Juggling finances when income is less than expenses. (Week 6)*

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: "Funding Strategies for the Rural Poor" statement from the IERD is translated into French and sent to other Houses with Francophone constituency, along with official French version of the Development Forum article. Desmond contributes a paper and a speech to the Council of Europe's Seminar on Orwell's 1984. Beverley prepares document on Europe-Eurasia Council, highlight is set of development manoeuvres to take advantage of IERD documentation for fund-raising. Jean-Baptiste Bougouma, formerly secretary of ICA France, invites ICA co-operation with the new African Organization for Development and Exchange, which unites people from several African countries to work to return the value of the human factor in economic, social and cultural development in Africa.

Internal: Team works on proposal for an urban research programme which will unite UNESCO research, learnings from other urban experiences (Copenhagen for example) and local La Courneuve (our neighbourhood) community activity and reflection. In Delhi, seven regional teams gather for bi-weekly meeting, working on Phase III design and stuffing 400 area letters with Phase II report, UN Forum article and interest card (4). Solid steps toward moving on the health programme in Chaurassi Cluster are made with a new proposal for a community based health care system, nutrition demonstrations weekly by Nuchem Company, visits with government health officials and the first door-to-door nutrition survey in Sarobi village (3).

Contradiction: Separating the dust from pure water in the midst of Northern India's daily sand storm. Assuring that we do what we said we will do while continuing to lay the groundwork for Quarter I, 1985. (Weeks 3,4)

External: Forty Areà Madras participants return from the Central International Event with regional plans for Phase III implementation. Thirty-five villagers from four cluster villages sign up for technical skills training under Government scheme. ICA participate in Annual General Meeting of the Federation of Voluntary Organisations in Karnataka, of which five organisations participated in the Central International Event.

Internal: Samson and Wankhede and Mary Hampton are sent out for New Skills Training, and extraordinary self support. House receives volunteers from the UK and Australia.

Internal: This week, Pratidan came back, we heard when Vaughn will arrive from Brussels. The landlord called Sheila in to talk and we all went to see "Char ek Mandir" a Hindi film and the 'Year of Order Council' came back from being framed.

Contradiction: Bringing off a great event in a facility not geared to being a training centre. (Week 2)

Contradiction: Holding the three main priorities of YOC prep, fund raising and IERD Phase III in equal balance and tension. (Week 4)*

The Guild workers assist the ICA staff to design a model for the 2nd year PHDP anniversary this coming May 11, 1984 and to be presented to the Barangay officials. The Health Care taker completed the Community diagnosis chart making for the year 1983-1984 to be submitted to the municipal development office.

Internal: Joselito Bensi Celebrates his 27th birthday anniversary on April 8th, we have a short celebration program in the House with one gallon of ice-cream, soft drinks and cakes. Quarter IV planning is done with specific activities to keep the staff moving. Week 1, we welcomed bask Vickie from the trek. She spent three days in Cebu and two days in Mahayag. On April 7, Don Cramer and Jesse Navarete arrive from Manila to co-ordinate workshop on Life Education, the Panchayat, Family Individual Declaration, Future Strategies for the Philippines and is participant in the Tiwi Expansion Meeting with members from public and private sectors.

Contradiction: Giving the full turn over of PHDP to Barangay council was hard try in midst of moving to MCD was more challenging. (Week 3)

THE CEBU HOUSE

External: A Health meeting is set up in the office of the Ministry of Education Culture and Sports which is attended by some doctors of the City of Lapu-Lapu and doctor from the town of Cordova. Development calls/appointments and follow up is done.

Internal: We have a visitor from the United Church of Christ in the Philippines (UCCP) with around one hundred people and the visit of Lyn and Bill Edwards and Marian Bassham. House celebration during the Holy Thrusday, Friday and all the members going to anywhere they want to go, some of the staff going to the church. Council on May and June - a preparation for the July and August Global Council Plenary.

Contradiction: Trooping Cebu Region in getting the monthly quota for July/August travel. (Week 3)

DAVAO-MAHAYAG

External: A food processing class is held to learn new uses for native fruits and root crops begins with 31 participants. Sewing industry moves to a new location. Health session in Barangay Delusom inoculates 31 children against common diseases.

Internal: Toon Wouto, volunteer from the Netherlands, having assisted greatly with electrical wiring, bookkeeping instruction and song creation is sent out with many directions for a smooth reentry to European society.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum of project activities while house members are increasingly involved in preparation for the Global Research Plenary. (Week 2)*

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: Brochure of second Volunteer Symposium in Japan, the first in Tokyo, is mocked up for June 24th. Membership renewal letters are sent along with an invitation in a Philippine Work Camp report meeting on May 16th. Two sojourners indicate plans to attend summer program in Chicago.

Internal: Model Building Taskforce assignment is completed in an intensive week-long push, a week also fulfilled by remarkable witnesses by sojourners and an eventful English cooking class led by chef David Reese.

Contradiction: Continually keeping ourselves wired into the entire Council which is now in process across the entire globe. (Week 4)

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Miss Huh Myung Hee visited Seoul House from Hong Kong for development. The Seoul House received 50,000 won (\$62.50) from Grandley Bank and 750,000 won (\$137.50) from AWCW (American Women).

Internal: The Seoul House went to Cheong Joo House for the check signals meeting.

Contradiction: Maintaining good pace now to avoid galloping later. (Week 4)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: In developing money for the RDS the team becomes surprised by one company donating a 1.2 million Won for agricultural drying machine for cluster and the head of a large company association volunteering to try to raise 1.5 million won in the last three days before RDS. The team is also impacted by the breaking of the long standing myth that you can't inkind goods with the receiving of two large green potted plants for use at RDS and later at the training center (5). Mrs. Basham and Mike Tippett visit overnight to see the cluster; the arrival of our new London House volunteer, Tabby Eichler and the hosting of Regional Council.

Contradiction: Crossing the stream without enough stepping stones in place. (Weeks 4,5)*

External: After renewing his ICA membership, shipping company director reports on the continuing problem of rescuing boat people including 65 Vietnamese he picked up last month. In addition, five membership fees are received for over 100,000 yen.

Internal: Shizuyo Sato and her children's arrival from Fukuoka brings a flurry of changes from kitchen renovation to program marketing.

Contradiction: Overcreating models and assignments as we transit to an 18 person House. (Weeks 3,4)*

Internal: Julia's birthday celebration demonstrates corporateness of the house women. Sailosi does his first collegium and house celebrates Easter with much needed discontinuity (3). House celebrates the completed life of Daniel Tupau, Tedu'u's father (2).

Contradiction: Intuitions are not enough when strategies need revision. Intensifying time use during up coming holidays. (Weeks 2,3)

External: Two RDSF's in Salinas and Tulare are attended by 90 people. Fresno downtown Association LENS is set for June. Los Angeles International Settlement LENS is happening in May. Planning for Statewide Economic Showcase Forum moves forward with lots of public sector participation. PAX presentation in Ventura, with nine church representatives. Tim Wegner is assigned by Houseon House to work on Stewardship. Alice and Frank attend SBA seminar on small business.

Internal: Progoff workshops and Global Brain study highlight Roundtable and weekly regional study night. Frank Knutson moves into UCLA Graduate School of Management. Marian Bassham and Mike Tippet stop through on way home from China trip. Decision to acquire facility for the next 16 years results in the sale of present facility and enthusiastic search for the new.

Contradiction: Everything is a priority: house sale, PAX, development, scheduled programs and House experiences fragmentation in trying to carry them individually. (Week 4)

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: House collegiums walk through a forest of materials, talk through many contexts and key insights on the future, then produces pluriform missional community model and sends it off in the mail. House decides to intensify its formation strategies following a swirl of IERD receptions and conversations — by creating a challenging marketing program for a regional CS1 on June 8, 9, and 10. Contradiction Mobilizing the willing people into effective participation. (Week 5)*

External: Five paid registrations come in for June Conference in Alberta; 23 letters are sent out to Manitoba government departments for June event. Final push is made to complete model-building assignment.

Internal: Guradian family invites House to dinner with members of the Madonna House Apostolate, a community of laypersons working in the inner city of Edmonton: collegiality is created over singing movement songs.

Contradiction: Telling a story that pushes through agency referrals to get to the local project practitioners. (Week 4)

AREA HOUSTON

Contradiction: Articulating learnings for HDZ Lab and finishing our YOC models by May 1. (Week 5)*

THE KANSAS CITY HOUSE

External: Four new yesses! Customers enable increase in work and pay. Aleicia Crichlow, first ICA volunteer youth in Kansas City this year, helps out by typing correspondence.

Internal: House celebrates Easter week by, at the beginning three members joining local church David and Burna Dunn and also Mark Rebstock and week is celebrated with an Easter egg hunt and dispersement to discontinuity.

Contradiction: Creating scheduling and communication systems that allow life in the "fast track". (Week 3)

LORIMOR HDP

ICA staff gives graduation address at the new readers JAMAL graduation in Port Morant, which was on the radio. Two articles appear in the newspapers about the recent HDTI graduation.

Internal: House holds a Good Friday Retreat in Woburn Lawn and House Council in Kingston, involving five ICA Board of Directors and nine village leaders, studying "The One, the Few and the Many", working on two Keystone Models evaluating the year and planing next four years. House sends out volunteers Teresa and Christof and Carl Ennis to Chicago for advance set up for GRA. House has two celebrations-beach trip and attending performance of a Caribbean Dance Troupe.

Contradiction: Holding the Year of Order Council as the first priority while intensifying circuits, treks, development, Phase III and management. (Weeks 3,4,5)*

External: Youth Forum with 100 participants sponsored by the Roman Catholic Parish in Quilicura lays foundation stone solidly in place for much more with this community and its 26 organized groups. Margariat Ruz, Sol de Septiembre delegate to Delhi, give Indian first secretary (of the Embassy) and Dr. Borgono from the World Health Organization a fine report on the Cental Event.

In addition, a presentation on the ICA and it's work was given to the staff on SENAR, a Federal Government agricultural training agency that has recently located a regional office in Rio Bonito, and has expressed interest in working with us.

Internal: Thursday night House Easter Celebration, complete with turkey dinner and large chocolate eggs for everyone (a Brazilian tradition) is a great beginning for three days of family discontinuity.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in all areas as July-August issues begin to demand attention. (Week 3)

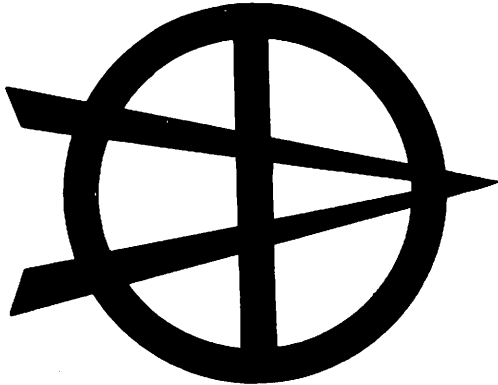

External: Twelve Portuguese from the Montemuro leave for the Iberian Academy in Avila, Spain, including two social workers from the Ministry of Social Services and two extension workers from the Ministry of Agriculture, with four cluster villages represented. The Castro Daire County Council provides its bus for the entire course, including the driver. Highlights of the course include the excursion to San Pedro del Arroyo to see cooperatives and be hosted by the local agricultural extension group to wine and local snacks, and the excursion to pioneer rural travelling schools, which fascinate the Portuguese with untold possibilities for the future.

Internal: Paul's family comes to spend Easter as House swells to 19 with the presence of the Armas family and Jane Sharp. Stefan's baptism in the Mezio church serves as an opportunity to host the village and celebrate Easter, extended family, Paul's appointment to the Panchayat, and the Iberian Academy assignments. Richard Kitney arrives in Mezio to do frame transfer with Paul in Lisbon, visiting with several cabinet ministers. Word comes from Misereor that funding will be secure until the end of 1985.

Contradiction: Consensing on the big picture before dispersing in several distinct and different roads for the rest of the year. (Week 5)*

Internal: We send YOC papers and receive and discuss those of Phoenix, Cebu and Washington. Desmond begins editing series of 12 articles on strategies of peace from 12 countries.

Contradiction: Weaving together threads of rural and urban development (Phase III IERD and La Courneuve - our city). (Weeks 5,6)*

USD 1000 from the Maadi Women's Guild is used to purchase furniture and office equipment for the Women's Guild room.

External: A great week of community planning as 50 Kabiro residents do quarterly plans for eight guilds which leads the environment, the school, the clinic and the women's group to begin implementation the next day. With the growing season beginning 14 more family gardens are fenced and four more rabbit hutches are built and stocked while all building materials are moved to the new store room. The Women's group has the local M.P. over for a fund raising event and net 25,287F (approximately \$200) for new sewing and knitting machines.

Internal: The House sends Rose and Boniface off to deal with family issues leaving the house with an E.G. majority which is celebrated with a party in honor of the baptism of four of the Were children.

Contradiction: Maintaining the momentum of community engagement with part of the auxiliary off to area planning and project directors meeting next week. (Week 5)*

External: Section team circuited six locations. Samutet leaders focus trek is completed and a visit to a demonstration health home was held.

Contradiction: Accepting the given situation as the next step when so many intruding issues of shifting our timeline. (Week 5)*

After 'Pooja' of the new Gram Panchayat Office, the members, including Deputy Sarpanch and Women's Mandal President Shantabai Sathe, processed through the village. Later, at a celebration which symbolized the Maliwada PJI as a true transition event, the Gram Panchayat was felicitated by Don Francis, when the members took the opportunity to express their hope of continued human development in Maliwada with ICA's guidance. The Youth Mandals meet to plan unity; stolen roofing tin is recovered from the Police, and the Panchayat Samiti sancitons roofing, flooring and fencing materials for the Dr. Ambedkar and Gautam Buddha Statues.

Internal: The House hosts the Area Project Journey Lab (PJI) team to 'pull-together' the results of the nine PJIs, producing MVDP Phase III learnings and Phase IV recommendations. Simultaneously, Hosting a felicitation of the new Gram Panchayat, and visiting English traveller John l'Anson, spiritizes the two-member house.

Contradiction: Seeing that Cluster/Block actuation and regional staff-training are related priorities of one Quarter Plan. (Week 6)*

RCF visit opens possibilities for new demonstration plots and fertiliser dealership (6). Forty-five villagers participate in three-day agricultural module and took part in seminar field trip to Dhapoli Agricultural College and reflection and were excited with new possibilities for local implementation. Canara Bank celebrates opening of large new facility with loan to villagers. We have a site visit from Frank Vay of Indian Statistical Institute as part of research study for European Funding Agencies (5). Human Development Association meeting for March is held with 30 participants from seven villages and other three sectors. Shivkar Village shines with newly painted school building and grove of trees, done by 20 young people from Vashi Leo Club (young lions) and the villagers. Training Centre begins to come "alive" as work moves toward ground floor completion at the end of May for opening (4).

Internal: Great fun at Roundtable with word game which increased vocabulary of house; M. Lanphear celebrates birthday with sweets passed around breakfast table! (6). Regional Staff Women are sent out to Delhi to pioneer in six week programme of literacy, geography, Order Life and current events on behalf of all village women. Wilfred De Costa arrives in Chikhale as volunteer (5). Interchange session intensifies with all participating and writing recommendations for Global Order Organisations (4).

Contradiction: Continuing on-going tasks in the midst of moving staff to other assignments. Collecting and recording data that gives us the real picture of development in the cluster. Building a solid plan when our universe keeps shifting around us.....(Weeks 4,5,6)*

Village Muslim women leader, Batto, continues to strategically forge a new role in the cluster by attending health room duties, welcoming visitors, participating in IERD and this week going for health care training in Delhi. Huge metal sign announcing HD cluster in two languages and six bright colours, from Bata, goes up at Cluster Node. Marketing mode in Delhi begins to take advantage of IERD base and two LENSs move into the pipe line. One with company whose project was a field visit. Rapid sharing of breakthroughs and materials between Chicago, Bombay and Hong Kong key to creating marketing momentum.

Internal: Economic Foundations model material arrives from Nairobi bringing forth delighted cry "It Works"! Hard week of bouts with dysentery, heat (110F in the shade), dust storms, broken jeep and diminishing troops creates situation where even the song "It Had To Be You" breaks loose profound spirit life at weekly ritual. Being true and being blue; made to be sad and made to be glad are part of same reality: Wonderful You. Battacharyas begin trek to join Continuum in Chicago.

Contradiction: Growing clarity on the poles of Action That Really Counts and Conservative Indecision in all of us while fuzzy on keys to Radical Corporateness. (Week 5)*

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Bharat Electronics Limited, becomes first public sector, IERD Regional Supporting Organisation in Bangalore with a contribution of 5,000 rupees. Second polio victim from Gunjurpalya, Shashigula, returns from hospital after a two week stay for corrective surgery sponsored by Bangalore Patron. Fourteen replies from all four states in Southern India and Sri Lanka, indicate strong interest in various IERD activities, and in the services of the ICA (6). ICA earns 500 rupees self-support by doing a Gram Sabba (one day village meeting), at a nearby village under the sponsorship of the Grindwell Norton Company. Industrial apprenticeship training is organised for 25 cluster village youth (5).

Internal: Poetry Roundtable illuminates British Culture. New football releases untapped energy of both staff and village youth (6). House members participate in Easter services at a local Catholic church, and a Roundtable discussing the consciousness of plants proves most interesting, but fails to dampen the vegetarian appetite (5).

Contradiction: Sensing that our 12 week cluster timeline lacks urgency and allows for repetitive ineffective activity as opposed to singular successful actions. Waking up to the fact that the cluster objectives set at a recent planning event can be accomplished in two weeks instead of 12, and intensifying our operational mode accordingly. (Week 5,6)*

Internal: Tajuddin brings his wife to South Sulawesi to introduce his family. Ahmad Rais explores deteriorating electrical wiring which turns itself off 10 times a day.

Contradiction: Holding the three main priorities of YOC prep, fund raising and IERD Phase III in equal balance and tension. (Week 4)*

AREA HONG KONG

THE MANILA HOUSE

External: Two LENS in one week with the Tiwi Think Tank, 45 participants including the Mayor of Tiwi, line agencies, PGI and the NPC; evening sessions from Monday to Thursday. Don and Tim arrive back from Tiwi in Manila with half an hour to change and go to the Rotary LENS in Tagaytay. One hundred and ninety-five Rotary Executive, with 12 ICA faculty, four of those regional colleagues. Annual Appeal is completed and Manila House Global Model is mailed (5). Three sessions on the Global Model is completed. Workshop is held at IIRR-CAVITE with ICA/AMSEF/IIRR and PRRM to plan the national workshop Phase III IERD in May. A visit is made with Rotary to further plan the Rotary LENS (4).

Internal: Week two finds the House expanding with a short visit from Chi Estrada from Davao, Jaime Vergera and Elizabeth Beach (5). Send out Claudia Cramer to logistics - Chicago and Don and Tim to Putsan, Tiwi. Joselito Bensi arrives in Manila to complete work needed for his passport. Two birthdays were celebrated this week and our geo-social research ends at the national archives with a picnic in Rizal Park (4).

Contradiction: Ur - phased tactical plan to accomplish our visions for the rest of the Quarter and the Year of Order Council. Lining up the eight faculty members needed for the LENS with 250 Rotary members plus writing procedures three nights away with a public holiday in-between. (Weeks 4,5)

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: Gordon talks to Taipei American School seniors on "Career Day" about community service occupations and same day sees completion of third week of Grindlays Bank Effective Supervision Course. House completes and mails our Model-Building Unit on Economic Foundations. Gordon attends farewell luncheon for James Lilley, Director of American Institute in Taiwan, and House is invited out to dinner with Iowa Lt. Governor Robert Anderson, hosted by long-time Chinese guardian, Rick Tsao (5). House raises 119% of its new (higher) development bottom line. Bill Wang confirms that he can join the teaching team for the CAPCO LENS in week 6. MANILA-THE PUTSAN HOUSE

External: Putsan HDP celebrated it's second year anniversary on May 11th with a community mass, a movie about family planning and a free clinic with approximately 50 patients attending. Prior to the anniversary one ICA staff and one international volunteer 'inkinded' medicines from local doctors and several election candidates, for the free clinic. Putsan HDP participated in the volleyball and basketball summer league in Tiwi. PGI hires a video crew to film Putsan HDP for display purposes in Manila. Nick Barker (IV) was guest speaker at PGI giving a three hour lecture on photography and completed documenting the project. The Tiwi multiple community development Think-Tank seminar was facilitated by ICA Manila and ICA Putsan in Tiwi Municipal Hall from April 30th to May 14th. Approximately 48 participants from private, public and other sectors attended. The Think-Tank document was distributed to all participants.

Internal: This week was highlighted by our move from the Putsan House to a larger more comfortable residence in Tiwi, to begin the expansion program. There was a major blitz on house cleaning, internal decor, and the formation of new teams during the house planning to co-ordinate the expansion and management of Putsan HDP. This week, the house using the newly purchased jeep attended J.J. Naverrete's christening in Naga. Other celebrations included Minda Estorgio's 17th birthday and a night's bowling in Tabaco. The House completed the study on future strategies for the Philippines.

Contradiction: Dividing our work force to cope with the expansion and the maintenance of Putsan HDP. (Week 6)*

Internal: Toon Wouto, volunteer from the Netherlands, having assisted greatly with electrical wiring, bookkeeping instruction and song creation is sent out with many directions for a smooth reentry to European society.

Contradiction: Keeping the momentum of project activities while house members are increasingly involved in preparation for the Global Research Plenary. (Week 2)

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: A pre-Chicago "gathering of the clan" in Osaka over the Golden Week period of many Japanese holidays provides all of us with opportunities for small talk, serious brooding and research visits; one to a Vietnamese refugee center and one to a 60-year-old communal village of 273 people, basically Buddhist but with Christian influences apparent in its symbolic and story life. Order Day studies, using Nan Grow's "Global Servant Force" paper and a section from Fox on meditations with facing into pain, brought out our creative teaching styles and pushed us into deeper understanding of the Order's current struggle with mission and identity.

Internal: Sandra's Uncle Harold visits; sojourners care for the House while all are gone to Osaka; Sunday afternoon excursion to Tokyo places of interest, enliven our life together in the Training Center.

Contradiction: Seeing that our Volunteer Symposium is part of the Year of Order Council and is an opportunity to build a new movement base. (Weeks 6-7)*

THE SEOUL HOUSE

External: Miss Huh Myung Hee visited Seoul House from Hong Kong for development. The Seoul House received 50,000 won (\$62.50) from Grandley Bank and 750,000 won (\$137.50) from AWCW (American Women).

Internal: The Seoul House went to Cheong Joo House for the check signals meeting.

Contradiction: Maintaining good pace now to avoid galloping later. (Week 4)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: The team is greatly excited by the Chong Won County Rural Development Symposium, attended by 200 people, two thirds of whom were villagers who, even in a busy time of year, stayed throughout the day. One elder is heard to say 'This will be recorded in history for it is the first time people from the four sectors have sat around the table talking about rural development'. Villagers, ICA staff and subcounty officials working together to design exhibits proves to be a time for deepening relationships.

Internal: The team spirit is boosted with the arrival of four more staff from Seoul and the use of student volunteers to help with practices and as workshop assistants. A Chinese meal following the Symposium causes staff's already free spirit to overflow.

Contradiction: Following up the numerous opportunities from the RDS while wanting to just relax and enjoy the victory. (Week 6)*

External: After renewing his ICA membership, shipping company director reports on the continuing problem of rescuing boat people including 65 Vietnamese he picked up last month. In addition, five membership fees are received for over 100,000 yen.

Internal: Shizuyo Sato and her children's arrival from Fukuoka brings a flurry of changes from kitchen renovation to program marketing.

Contradiction: Overcreating models and assignments as we transit to an 18 person House. (Weeks 3,4)

THE SYDNEY HOUSE

External: May Area circuits are kicked off with a trip to Murrin Bridge where final editing of documentation and first typesetting takes place. A possibility for documentation funding is found locally. Marsha Stansbury and Barry Oakley are sent out to Adelaide/Melbourne circuit. Sandy Powell is sent to Brisbane to be joined by Wayne Nelson in Darwin/Perth circuit. The circuits will cover the entire Area in three weeks (4). Three teams are sent out on development in five capital cities. A big push on development in this area with 15 visits this week. Two colleague events are tentatively scheduled in Darwin and Brisbane (3).

Internal: Easter discontinuity culminates in a corporate retreat of reflection on the past year, a "Special Olympics" and barbeque, ending with a light supper and toasts to the future. Our one week methods school which begins Sunday night has everyone working long hours, twice daily pedagogy sessions and many hours recruiting (7). LENS session begins this week with our developing Spanish speaking LENS team and training in basic methods for youth in community "Quilicura". New director is elected in Sol de Septiembre (6).

Internal: We have moved from a tiny four bedroom apartment to a six bedroom house and still the rooms fill up, even find it necessary to sleep some on couches. We welcomed Omar for a two week sojourn (7). Holding the tension pole between celebrating one's birthday and celebrating our fast day (6).

Contradiction: How do we maintain ourselves in our commitment to the long march with so many different contexts for the same mission. Creating a structure to maximize our creativity and communications for our mission. (Weeks 6,7)*

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: Canadian Embassy approves request for a new Toyota diesel jeep and money to build an addition on the House. House and team get to know president of B. Braun Company and his family and they donate furniture, help and money all in the same week. Project villages participate in a whirl of activities including two youth modules, farmers' association elections, community planning meeting and the walls are completed on one community's community centre.

Internal: David Heslop returns from Paraguay with new visa and David Wood-Smith marks trip home to England.

Contradiction: Consensing with the Rio Bonito team on what needs to be done during July and August. (Week 6)*

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: The audit team received long pending positive comments from EEC on Zambia and India reports. The first global circular of Phase III was mailed to delegates, NSC, GAB and Houses. Development team participated in two meetings with National Women's Council and with EEC, European Parliamentarians and NGO's and receives yes from famous ICA lawyer De Bandt to send out introductory IERD products letter to 50 corporations on this stationery.

Internal: Collegiums focus on Iberia (Portugal & Spain) and highlight HDZ activity and Academy reports.

Contradiction: Caring well for immediate concerns in a way that opens the future. (Week 7)*

THE BOMBAY NEXUS HOUSE

External: NST visits Telco factory on Wednesday outing. Nexus participates in Area Bombay's pull together of the nine project journey labs. Danida grant audit is signed marking the finish of that cross centrum task. Trip to Pune to visit NSC member C.S. Kirloskar gives the possibility of future support.

Internal: Mr. B. Rudramootry, NSC member returns from Rome and reports on his month of helping to write the book. He said, "Before I participated in ICA now I am involved." CS-I papers are done in a morning collegium series. Fourteen fans are inked and delivered and installed at Nexus, Chikhale, and NST facilities.

Contradiction: Needing to use tight cross centrum troops on IERD documentation and financial reports to release IERD advocacy. (Week 6)*

External: Our methods are demonstrated as Training Inc. participates in strategic planning and an alderman leads vocational conversations with northwest communities. Reddi Thomas makes major development calls with us and new people respond to a summer intern programme with Phase I. We grapple with life style as we participate in Tai Chi, Kara-Ti, meditation, study of "falling In Love" in the "Road Less Travelled", and are surrounded by Global Logistics Eventfulness.

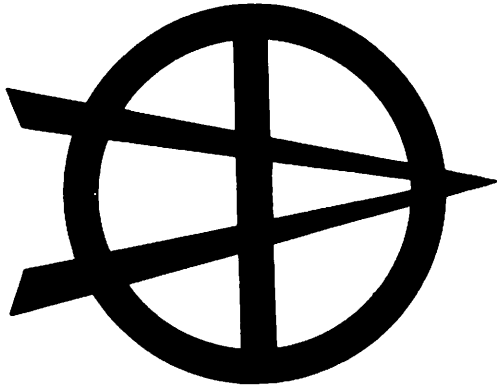

AREA MADRID

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Area celebrates the completion of the Iberian Academy held in Avila with transformed troops and key contacts with tri-sectoral groups. Arthur Anderson and Co. confirms annual donation of \$1,000 (USD) (6). Final preparations for "Iberian Academy" near completion with inkind photocopy and video machines secured, materials xeroxed, and financial plan in place. Donations are received from AMOCO and ICI affiliate Nurel (total \$500). Recruitment follow-up confirms 13 Portuguese villagers, five Spanish villagers, and three other participants (3).

Internal: Area check signals is held with whole area present, plus two from Brussels Nexus, ends with celebrative meal. The House deposits \$1,000 (USD) self-support income in first 10 days of May (6). House receives its newest member, Rene Matthew Stocker Soderlind at House Church. Deposit of \$2800 self-support income brings month total to \$3700 (3).

Contradiction: Creating strategies to ensure programme momentum over next several months while securing a realistic financial base. Now that the rubber has hit the road on Iberian Academy, the question is how to get the wheels rolling on the next two months. (Week 6)*

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Iberian Academy reflection brings all participants to the House in Mezio one week later to create a model for national staff formation: two VLI's one advanced training module, village circuits and a June children's program, all staffed with Montemuro villagers. Ministry of Social Affairs comes twice to Mezio in an effort to nail down service delivery to the villagers.

Internal: Spring arrives as a mixed blessing as the Peugeot dies one more time, the house labors all day in the garden planting tomatoes, carrots and peppers and the House abounds with life and energy as neighbours, villagers and cluster residents spend Sunday afternoon renewing old acquaintances after the Iberian Academy. Long collegiums writing the HDZ paper produce shouts and passionate arguments and finally consensus. Cathy's birthday is celebrated at breakfast with champagne and chocolate cake.

Contradiction: Putting all the small but tempting little pieces together in a dazzling long-range strategy that makes sense not only between now and the beginning of July, but worthy of total expenditure for the next ten years. (Week 6)*

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: IERD delegates present debriefing at Commonwealth Institute to the public. They agree on future role as public speakers using U.K. exhibit, it raises the question of ICA role and strategy in rural development in U.K. Sir Eric Norrio (ex High Commissioner to Kenya, India and Malaysia) agrees to be patron of Village Volunteer Service Programme.

Internal: Self-support in hostelry hits bonanza - three Zimbabweans plus one Japanese come in as paying guests for three months. Continent raises all but \$1,000 for projected self-support expectations. During our first month of continental release point.

Contradiction: Juggling finances when income is less than expenses. (Week 6)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Meetings with Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) explore taking IERD research to development community. Yano Friedman, architect/illustrator/sociologist, agrees to read draft of IERD book. He specializes in using cartoons to make information accessible to villagers. Volunteers in five cities begin translation of Project Directory. Team finishes proposal for '84-'85 - IMAGES: LA COURNEUVE.

Internal: We send YOC papers and receive and discuss those of Phoenix, Cebu and Washington. Desmond begins editing series of 12 articles on strategies of peace from 12 countries.

Contradiction: Weaving together threads of rural and urban development (Phase III IERD and La Courneuve - our city). (Weeks 5,6)

This was followed by a week of Area Strategy planning in Region Vienna and visits and strategy planning in week 4 in Region Budapest. The possibility of Phase III along with other programs were opened up with the assistance of Hannerl Golda from Berlin during weeks 3 and 4 and Brunex weeks 4 and 5.

Two Fourd Foundation funded consultants spend the week in Bayad in preparation for designing documentation for local development in multiple community projects programme. USD 1000 from the Maadi Women's Guild is used to purchase furniture and office equipment for the Women's Guild room.

Internal: The House has three collegiums on self-support to determine stipend base recommendations for 84-85 that approaches a 'healthy sustenance'.

Contradiction: Communicating ICA's 'new' relationship to project actuation in the Tisment villages via the circuit team, when the 'old' relationship of considerable funding in the Bayad villages is well known and still in operation. (Week 7)

AREA ABIDJAN

THE ABIDJAN HOUSE

External: VLI with 22 leaders from the Akrobangbokro cluster is successfully completed. The participants decide to send a team to all the other village clusters to report on the VLI. Planning consultation is scheduled with Gonfreville for June 4,5,6. It's a textile industry - the largest industry in Ivory Coast.

Internal: Patricia takes a trip for The Canadian Embassy and visits the ICA Brobo project as well!

Contradiction: July and June travel dates are fast approaching, but we still have a million francs to raise! (Week 7)*

THE LAGOS HOUSE

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Inclusion of VLI grads in circuit teams enables us to do six circuits simultaneously. Key authorisation visit with Ministry of Social Development opens up possibility of future cooperative effort (7). Future funding possibilities open up with K800 cheque from National Energy Corporation and site visit by Canadian Embassy. Second week of May staff training event ends on high note as teams do D.O.O.P. practice in preparation for field work next week (6).

Internal: James Wambua is sent out to Nairobi en route to Chicago GRA. Andrew Weller, U.K. volunteer returns from trip to South Africa. Great 'International Cocktail' celebration is held midway through staff training programme (7). New U.K. volunteer, David Hemblade arrives after five month adventurous trip overland from Cairo to Lusaka. House welcomes first Nexus visit for year in person of Rob Jennings-Teats (6).

Contradiction: Uncoordinated cluster district, ward and funding agencies development plans. Consensing on models for circuit design, IERD follow-up event, Y.O.C. strategic organisation, in midst of focussing on May training programme. (Weeks 6,7)*

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: Third Village Leaders training school graduates 32 and first three basic circuit training school taught by village leaders preps final weeks before launch of 60 villages to be self-sustaining units. Receive letter confirming Canadian Grant and Ford Foundation confirms a one and quarter million shilling (100,000) grant for a three year IERD Phase III program called "Sharing Approaches That Work". Charles Lingo finishes visits with IERD delegates in Tanzania and Uganda and Moses Lekesio leaves to join him for trip to Rwanda.

Internal: A great week of intensifying the YOC as Henry and Elinah Ikaturhu get marriage certificate, U.K and U.S. visas and family visit for departures next Wednesday. At the same time begin prep for first of two council orientation for 17 staff to look at Global Models.

Contradiction: Developing the revolutionary context for YOC orientation while keeping the spotlight of focus on the village leaders launch. (Week 7)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Women's Groups buy two sewing machines and hires a fundi to teach them to sew hoping to net a contract for C.C.F. uniform for the Kabiro schools C.C.F. children. The school committee decides to press formal charges against the Head Master for stealing 25,000K (\$2,000) as the committee gets clear that is their school and ICA has "turned it over". The clinic has meetings with the Ministry of Labor over the issue of retirement for four health caretakers while preparing for negotiations to renew their contract with F.P.I.A.

Internal: Sam and Ester get their wedding license just in time to be witnesses as the Ikutukus arrange to get theirs.

Contradiction: As the auxiliary plans to go to Chicago for the GRA, and leave the whole project in the hands of the residents committee, the committee chairperson refuses to call meetings because two of the 21 members object to her being chairperson. (Week 8)*

External: Section team circuited six locations. Samutet leaders focus trek is completed and a visit to a demonstration health home was held.

Internal: A one week house health training with 27 participants with films held each night was completed. Toilets were constructed and the house completed an intensive garden. Rosemary and Wey were sent out to Nairobi and R. Osiuo returned.

Contradiction: Accepting the given situation as the next step when so many intruding issues of shifting our timeline. (Week 5)

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: The new Maliwada Gram Panchayat starts its term by repairing tap water systems in the village. Daulatadad percolation dam opens whilst in Karodi the construction of another dam is underway to potentially irrigate six villages. In Rampuri a borewell is dug, finding water at 300 ft. and providing Rampuri with its first clean water supply. Maliwada's Laxman Devatkar gets 50% loan for a Rs.50,000 new sawmill whilst in Jambala six farmers receive loans for cows and goats. Jambala also sees the completion of its community centre and the sanctioning of rs2,000 for its preschool. In Wanjawadi the villagers pay a teacher from a neighbouring village to start Wanjawadi's first preschool with a class of 40 children. Meanwhile in Maliwada the Buddhist community celebrated "Buddha Purnima" and showed an Ambedkar movie.

Internal: The House is hosted at 'Peerbaba' mutton celebration in Abidmandi. Ramesh Ye'shankar is sent out to Paniel for self-support sign-writing, and an English collegium and class is led by guest John L'Anson.

Contradiction: Relating work of week eight to work of week 10 while team participates in week nine Regional Training. (Week 7)*

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Chikhale tap water is turned on as other water dries upFirst wall of training centre is plastered and one half of great hall tiles are inkinded. RCF visit opens possibilities for new demonstration plots and fertiliser dealership (6). Forty-five villagers participate in three-day agricultural module and took part in seminar field trip to Dhapoli Agricultural College and reflection and were excited with new possibilities for local implementation. Canara Bank celebrates opening of large new facility with loan to villagers. We have a site visit from Frank Vay of Indian Statistical Institute as part of research study for European Funding Agencies (5). Human Development Association meeting for March is held with 30 participants from seven villages and other three sectors. Shivkar Village shines with newly painted school building and grove of trees, done by 20 young people from Vashi Leo Club (young lions) and the villagers. Training Centre begins to come "alive" as work moves toward ground floor completion at the end of May for opening (4).

Internal: Great fun at Roundtable with word game which increased vocabulary of house; M. Lanphear celebrates birthday with sweets passed around breakfast table! (6). Regional Staff Women are sent out to Delhi to pioneer in six week programme of literacy, geography, Order Life and current events on behalf of all village women. Wilfred De Costa arrives in Chikhale as volunteer (5). Interchange session intensifies with all participating and writing recommendations for Global Order Organisations (4).

Contradiction: Continuing on-going tasks in the midst of moving staff to other assignments. Collecting and recording data that gives us the real picture of development in the cluster. Building a solid plan when our universe keeps shifting around us.....(Weeks 4,5,6)

Village Muslim women leader, Batto, continues to strategically forge a new role in the cluster by attending health room duties, welcoming visitors, participating in IERD and this week going for health care training in Delhi. Huge metal sign announcing HD cluster in two languages and six bright colours, from Bata, goes up at Cluster Node. Marketing mode in Delhi begins to take advantage of IERD base and two LENSs move into the pipe line. One with company whose project was a field visit. Rapid sharing of breakthroughs and materials between Chicago, Bombay and Hong Kong key to creating marketing momentum.

Internal: Economic Foundations model material arrives from Nairobi bringing forth delighted cry "It Works"! Hard week of bouts with dysentery, heat (110F in the shade), dust storms, broken jeep and diminishing troops creates situation where even the song "It Had To Be You" breaks loose profound spirit life at weekly ritual. Being true and being blue; made to be sad and made to be glad are part of same reality: Wonderful You. Battacharyas begin trek to join Continuum in Chicago.

Contradiction: Growing clarity on the poles of Action That Really Counts and Conservative Indecision in all of us while fuzzy on keys to Radical Corporateness. (Week 5)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Forty-two youth from Boghanhalli and Panathur sign up for Industrial Apprenticeships, under a government scheme. Government official promises to do his utmost to get them training in the area. Sue and Kate, British volunteers go to Madras for a few days to explore the possibility of spending some time with a Madras based voluntary organisation (8). After a persistent and uphill bureaucratic struggle the Mahila Mandal of Boganhalli village is finally registered. Development teams operate in Bangalore and Madras and secure at least two solid Phase III Regional Supporting Organisations. Shiva and mother attend city hospital for training in the exercises required for his recently operated on leg (7).

Internal: City archives are sorted out in preparation for vacating the premises for the summer (8). The House visits "the Only Place" for Roundtable and the celebration of Danod Prakash's birthday. (The only place is the only place in the world to our knowledge that serves first quality large steaks for less than two dollars U.S.). Global relatedness is experienced as House listens to live broadcast of the English football (soccer) final on the radio in which the home town teams of two of the house members were playing each other (7).

Contradiction: Succumbing to the rising heat, and the July/August preoccupations. Waiting for answers from somewhere else, or waiting for the proverbial bus when you wake up to the fact that not only are you already on it, but that you are driving it. (Week 7,8)*

Contradiction: Finding ways to get the bureaucratic system to operate out of our time line rather than theirs. (Week 7)*

THE HONG KONG HOUSE

THE TAIPEI HOUSE

External: The two week period is characterized by abundance as house/region team completes effective supervision course with Grindlay's Bank begin a second with GTE, and joined by Tuecke and Rafos do a LENS with CAPCO (Amoco-China American Petrochemical) on the intervening weekend. Graduate of Grindlay's course joins GTE Team. IERD delegates meet for spirited debriefing at legislative Yuan offices. One thousand five hundred US dollars in hand toward monthly bottomlines.

AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: A pre-Chicago "gathering of the clan" in Osaka over the Golden Week period of many Japanese holidays provides all of us with opportunities for small talk, serious brooding and research visits; one to a Vietnamese refugee center and one to a 60-year-old communal village of 273 people, basically Buddhist but with Christian influences apparent in its symbolic and story life. External: Mr. Rafos visited Seoul House for LENS marketing and course from Monday to Saturday. He and LENS team (Lee Kang Jin, Lee Kyung Hae, Lee Jeong Rim, Han Kyung Ahe) visited Jeonju city (south area of Korea) for LENS course of Jeonju Jesus Hospital.

Internal: From Tuesday to Wednesday, the House had a LENS pedagogy ending with a LENS reflection on Saturday.

Contradiction: Keeping strong relationship with the guardians in the midst of many internal requirements. (Week 7)*

SEOUL-THE CHEONG WON HOUSE

External: The House got \$40 from Eden Church and used it for the R.D.S. Letters were sent to SC members for the follow-up after finishing RDS. RDS sponsors were visited in order to say "thank you very much for your help".

Contradiction: Everything is a priority: house sale, PAX, development, scheduled programs and House experiences fragmentation in trying to carry them individually. (Week 4)

THE SEATTLE HOUSE

External: Vigorous CS-I recruitment sees six solid registrations at week minus three with promise of more to come. Saturday morning the House enjoyed a lively workshop on pluriform models of Pluriform Missional Communities. Contradiction: Convincing people that now is the time for program over-against the onset of the summer "coast". (Week 6)

THE MINNEAPOLIS HOUSE

External: Our team conducts initial vision, contradictions, and proposals session in two hours for a new consortium on family violence and child abuse meeting at Minneapolis Children's Hospital. THE NEW YORK HOUSE

External: Development circuit uncovers several Presbyterian churches interested in ICA presentations. Excitement mounts over PAX sales.

Internal: Another room is completed in New York facility for new boarders arrival. Research packets arrive from six out of seven of our "sister" exchange locations.

Contradiction: Increasing demands with decreasing troops. (Week 7)

THE ROCHESTER HOUSE

External: Albany Metro Regional Team members lead three events in two days, beginning April 16 when Ellen Howie does a program for Christ Church (UM, Troy) women on global work of the ICA. The same day, Susan Brainard leads a dynamite workshop for Cooperative Extension professionals in northern New York State; workshop, on strengthening 4-H adult leadership, was built by Susan and Reginal Team colleagues. Contradiction: Finishing "Talking Papers" which can never be finished except with our lives in the days and years ahead. (Week 5)

BOSTON-THE STARKS HOUSE

External: Ten from Boston join the house and Starks Enterprise Corporation members for 3rd Saturday workday of cutting wood, cleaning, salvaging and landscaping. Workday crew celebrates with participation in Starks School Fair and cookout on lemon stream with many items brought by S.E.C. families. Starks Bi-monthly forum hears a speaker on war tax resistance. Tim reports that Danforth downtown revitalization construction begins (7). Unbelievable (for a town as small as Starks) A third community development block grant has been awarded to Starks - 304,000 for housing rehab, community beautification, business loan, and fire department. Second Starks workday moves mountains (of trash) - celebrated with potluck supper and live music from Accapella Group. Beth and David spend several days learning by volunteering at home (Orland, Maine) (6).

Internal: House celebrates volunteers presence with fiddlehead picking and a strawberry shortcake party for David's 24th birthday (7). Beth's advisor has pertinent insights and observations; Glen Frederic's funeral is attended by close family members and Bill and Heffers (6).

Contradiction: Completing the final cornshop cleaning and salvaging to reduce insurance costs and improve facility appeal to prospective tenants. Enlivening some of the ongoing cornshop social enterprises - chintz and library. (Week 6,7)

AREA MONTREAL

THE TORONTO HOUSE

External: "Sharing Approaches That Work" Symposium, keynoted by reports from IERD delegates, is attended by 55 participants from across Ontario (including 16 Natives), and supported by a regional team of 33 people including four Natives. Square dancing celebration is a highlight. Regional team, 30 strong, meets afterward for reflection. Meanwhile Rama Reserve implements LENS plans with Community Day, youth Karate Club, Newsletter, and revitalized committees.

External: The facilitators Training Course joins old colleagues and new contacts for a week-end of intensive training which is also financially profitable. Habitations Jeanne-Mance becomes even more exposed to the world as its mural is the subject of an art exhibit and the adult literacy class goes on video for the school board.

Internal: The highlights for the past three weeks were; Frank Hample from Maine gives a broad overview of what is happening in New England and how it affects the Maritimes. The Pluriform Mission Community Model is completed after a delightful two days in a Laurentian hills cottage village.

Contradiction: Catalyzing four sector network in Mexico with very few contacts with the public sector. (Week 7)*

THE GUATEMALA CITY HOUSE

External: The DOOP model is initial in the Guastatoya cluster with a workshop creating the stakes for Monte Grande (one village in the cluster) as teams of new volunteers (6) have their second opportunity to practice before the two circling teams leave next week for both ends of the cluster.

Internal: Space of the team is expanded and deepened as the house digs drainages during workday, and studies paper on the birth of the Order. Christopher Epleys birthday (4) and send out Ken Epley to USA for self-support.

Contradiction: Creating the new casino while at the same time creating the back-up systems to do it. (Week 7)*

Contradiction: Focusing on immediacy of getting everyone to Chicago when the real task is inventing our next 16 years. (Week 6)

External: First IERD Regional Symposium is set-up and well recruited for 16 May while recruitment blitz for HDTs on 20 May yields many new prospects. Council travel funding is well underway as letters written now total 49, one church responds with one airfare, Eastern receives travel proposal and all staff receive rare 90 day US visas in one day. Five hundred bags of cement is received for five village construction projects.

Internal: Juan Arce and Rocio Lanao are sent out to Chicago for Council prep tasks, taking completed copies of 10 page YOC model for global mailing. More furniture and kitchen ware is received to make new Jesus Maria house decored and liveable.

Contradiction: Turning registration, inkind and cash commitments to reality for the HDTs beginning in one week. (Week 6)

AREA CARACAS

THE CARACAS HOUSE

External: Preparations for the sixth Human Development Methods Lab begin with victories in dorm set up, curriculum shifts and recruitment scheme. Three and a half hour visit with the Maraven Oil Company results in invitation for Phase I Town Meetings in the Monagas District. Mennen of Venezuela donates first time ever gift (4). Proposals are completed to "Petroleos de Venezuela" and Miserior. The team receives visits fro Alan Costa, U.S. Embassy economic attache, catholic lay workers and the new doctor in Tapipa (3).

Internal: Tremendous visits are held during Cano Negro's Patron Saint Festival with Fr. Rafael Davila, Ana Carballo and Fr. Patrick of the Children's Ecclesiastical movement. Tony Beltran suffers and survives mugging in Caracas (4). Amidst Holy Week celebrations quarter planning is done and visioning sessions are held on the summer and next year. The Town Meeting is used as an individual spirit exercise. Bob Rank does a collegium on "Gropo Social" (3).

Contradiction: Marching full-steam toward the school with limited resources. Putting the new into a form that both cares for the House journey and takes a bold leap programatically. (Weeks 3,4)

AREA BUENOS AIRES

THE SANTIAGO HOUSE

External: A great LENS climaxed our intense month of translation and training with 21 Chileans participating in the journey to LENS facilitator. The House and the IERD participants and their spouses were treated to a fine dinner by the first secretary and his wife at the Indian Embassy. Our one week methods school which begins Sunday night has everyone working long hours, twice daily pedagogy sessions and many hours recruiting (7). LENS session begins this week with our developing Spanish speaking LENS team and training in basic methods for youth in community "Quilicura". New directiva is elected in Sol de Septiembre (6).

Internal: We have moved from a tiny four bedroom apartment to a six bedroom house and still the rooms fill up, even find it necessary to sleep some on couches. We welcomed Omar for a two week sojourn (7). Holding the tension pole between celebrating one's birthday and celebrating our fast day (6).

Contradiction: How do we maintain ourselves in our commitment to the long march with so many different contexts for the same mission. Creating a structure to maximize our creativity and communications for our mission. (Weeks 6,7)

AREA RIO DE JANEIRO

THE RIO DE JANEIRO HOUSE

External: Another week of high activity in the project communities resulting in two more planning meetings, a youth community forum, the formation of a mothers' association to oversee the Bracana preschool and a movie on organizing workdays for the youth in Mata. Another CR\$1.5 million donation edges the house towards financial security through to September as an US\$8000 proposal is submitting to the Bank of America. The House receives an IBM self-correcting typewriter in Prime condition and secures office for a further month.

Internal: A week long stay by Daniel, the brother of Esther who participated in last years HDTI in Portugal, inspires mass activity. sufficiently stimulated, he promises to return in the near future.

Contradiction: Organising the team 'end of year' celebration as well as celebrating the work of the communities in the face of an ever-shortened time-line.*

GLOBAL NEXUS

THE BRUSSELS NEXUS HOUSE

External: The audit team received long pending positive comments from EEC on Zambia and India reports. The first global circular of Phase III was mailed to delegates, NSC, GAB and Houses. Development team participated in two meetings with National Women's Council and with EEC, European Parliamentarians and NGO's and receives yes from famous ICA lawyer De Bandt to send out introductory IERD products letter to 50 corporations on this stationery.

Internal: Collegiums focus on Iberia (Portugal & Spain) and highlight HDZ activity and Academy reports.

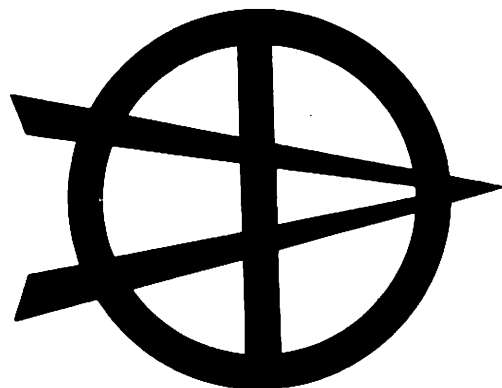

THE MADRID HOUSE

External: Area celebrates the completion of the Iberian Academy held in Avila with transformed troops and key contacts with tri-sectoral groups. Arthur Anderson and Co. confirms annual donation of \$1,000 (USD).

Internal: Area check signals is held with whole area present, plus two from Brussels Nexus, ends with celebrative meal. The House deposits \$1,000 (USD) self-support income in first 10 days of May.

Contradiction: Creating strategies to ensure programme momentum over next several months while securing a realistic financial base. (Week 6)

LISBON—THE LAMEGO HOUSE

External: Roundtable beginning at 9:00 p.m. holds villagers fascinated until midnight as Edmundo presents "Brasil night" with thousands of slides and speeches. Post Iberian Academy victories happen as the Ministry of Social Affairs assigns two new social workers to Castro Daiere County to work directly with service delivery in the Montemuro. Two social workers doing their three partium months will live with ICA staff beginning June 15 - a gift from Monsenhor Ilidio and his Rural School. The presidential commission on the Feminine Condition commits to a week's meetings in the Montemuro, also staying at the ICA House. The Swiss Group, The Institute for Rural Integrated Development, spends day with ICA in Mezio, asking for collaboration on Community Forums.

Internal: Edmundo makes the leap from dentist to sheep expert and became the Director of the Summer Sheep Foot-dip Project, co-sponsored by the Ministry of Agriculture. The garden is replanted, this time the right way, with villagers' assistance.

Contradiction: Using corporate time in a disciplined way to bring about catalytic action as opposed to boundless good ideas. (Week 7)*

AREA LONDON

THE LONDON HOUSE

External: IERD delegates present debriefing at Commonwealth Institute to the public. They agree on future role as public speakers using U.K. exhibit, it raises the question of ICA role and strategy in rural development in U.K. Sir Eric Norrio (ex High Commissioner to Kenya, India and Malaysia) agrees to be patron of Village Volunteer Service Programme.

Internal: Self-support in hostelry hits bonanza - three Zimbabweans plus one Japanese come in as paying guests for three months. Continent raises all but \$1,000 for projected self-support expectations. During our first month of continental release point.

Contradiction: Juggling finances when income is less than expenses. (Week 6)

AREA PARIS

THE PARIS HOUSE

External: Meetings with Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) explore taking IERD research to development community. Yano Friedman, architect/illustrator/sociologist, agrees to read draft of IERD book. He specializes in using cartoons to make information accessible to villagers. Volunteers in five cities begin translation of Project Directory. Team finishes proposal for '84-'85 - IMAGES: LA COURNEUVE.

Internal: We send YOC papers and receive and discuss those of Phoenix, Cebu and Washington. Desmond begins editing series of 12 articles on strategies of peace from 12 countries.

Contradiction: Weaving together threads of rural and urban development (Phase III IERD and La Courneuve - our city). (Weeks 5,6)

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Two evenings with colleagues and friends were held reporting on the IERD led by participants in the India Event. Work continues on the paper on The LEARNINGS REGARDING WOMEN IN DEVELOPMENT, to be submitted to the Federal Ministry of Health. A weekend looking at the next four years in light of the next 16 years reveals a deep yearning for movemental engagement intensification, in the midst of a multitude of exciting visions that yet need to be integrated and woven into a powerful myth and action.

Internal: Service Ventures contracts expand, John leaves for Rome and volunteer from the Netherlands arrives for the sojourn month, shifting us to new patterns and relationships.

Contradiction: In the face of overwhelming tasks and dispersion of people, we struggle for effective ways to appropriate the greatness on the journey of the Area, the House, and the individuals, as the wind of the future blows wildly in our face. (Week 8)*

Internal: Patricia takes a trip for The Canadian Embassy and visits the ICA Brobo project as well!

Contradiction: July and June travel dates are fast approaching, but we still have a million francs to raise! (Week 7)

THE LAGOS HOUSE

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Inclusion of VLI grads in circuit teams enables us to do six circuits simultaneously. Key authorisation visit with Ministry of Social Development opens up possibility of future cooperative effort (7). Future funding possibilities open up with K800 cheque from National Energy Corporation and site visit by Canadian Embassy. Second week of May staff training event ends on high note as teams do D.O.O.P. practice in preparation for field work next week (6).

Internal: James Wambua is sent out to Nairobi en route to Chicago GRA. Andrew Weller, U.K. volunteer returns from trip to South Africa. Great 'International Cocktail' celebration is held midway through staff training programme (7). New U.K. volunteer, David Hemblade arrives after five month adventurous trip overland from Cairo to Lusaka. House welcomes first Nexus visit for year in person of Rob Jennings-Teats (6).

Contradiction: Uncoordinated cluster district, ward and funding agencies development plans. Consensing on models for circuit design, IERD follow-up event, Y.O.C. strategic organisation, in midst of focussing on May training programme. (Weeks 6,7)

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: IERD Phase III becomes clearer as three week trip is completed to Tanzania, Rwanda and Uganda to begin planning with core groups for September events and Kenya National Council of Social Services agrees to sponsor three year Ford Foundation Programme called "Sharing Approaches That Work". Five day council orientation is held for first 18 people by studying eight research areas, computer might, film, 'Bad News Bears'. Eldoret circuit inkind three impact sign boards and two other impacts are set up for a total of 60 new villages.

Internal: Send off Henry Ikatukhu to London for one month of development and then off to Council. Great meat roast on patio is held to welcome back Mauritius team of Larry Philbrook and Judi Wiegel and Moses Lekesio and Charles Lingo from non-resident nation trip.

Contradiction: Finding operating modes that allow spin off activities not to interrupt the flow and momentum of the village leaders launch. (Week 8)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Kabiro Community begins to plan reorganization for July and August with no ICA staff resident in Kabiro by assigning Mama Wahu (without any family members) to live in Kabiro Community Center along with Timothy Magale who already rented a space there. The Kabiro family informs us that in July the land board will consider our purchase of two acres of land for public facilities in Kabiro. Eleven rabbits are killed and sold for meat to reduce a population problem as hutches are being built more slowly than expected. The Minister of Labour meets the clinic advisory board over the retirement of four health caretakers who happen to be the four mamas who voluntarily struggled to start the whole project in 1979 and concludes that yes they will have to be retired from their current duties but strongly urged the project to find significant employment for them in the project.

Internal: House receives Rose back from a funeral and sends Nixon off to another while Sam and Esther are off to orientation week and Hubert celebrates his birthday with eight E.G. from five months to six years of age.

Contradiction: Unformulated assignments for village teachers to take over all project activity in July and August. (Week 9)*

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Section team circuited six locations. Samutet leaders focus trek is completed and a visit to a demonstration health home was held.

Internal: A one week house health training with 27 participants with films held each night was completed. Toilets were constructed and the house completed an intensive garden. Rosemary and Wey were sent out to Nairobi and R. Osio returned.

Contradiction: Accepting the given situation as the next step when so many intruding issues of shifting our timeline. (Week 5)

AREA BOMBAY

BOMBAY—THE MALIWADA HOUSE

External: The new Maliwada Gram Panchayat starts its term by repairing tap water systems in the village. Daulatadad percolation dam opens whilst in Karodi the construction of another dam is underway to potentially irrigate six villages. In Rampuri a borewell is dug, finding water at 300 ft. and providing Rampuri with its first clean water supply. Maliwada's Laxman Devatkar gets 50% loan for a Rs.50,000 new sawmill whilst in Jambala six farmers receive loans for cows and goats. Jambala also sees the completion of its community centre and the sanctioning of rs2,000 for its preschool. In Wanjawadi the villagers pay a teacher from a neighbouring village to start Wanjawadi's first preschool with a class of 40 children. Meanwhile in Maliwada the Buddhist community celebrated "Buddha Purnima" and showed an Ambedkar movie.

Internal: The House is hosted at 'Peerbaba' mutton celebration in Abidmandi. Ramesh Yr'shankar is sent out to Parnel for self-support sign-writing, and an English collegium and class is led by guest John L'Anson.

Contradiction: Relating work of week eight to work of week 10 while team participates in week nine Regional Training. (Week 7)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Chikhale tap water is turned on as other water dries upFirst wall of training centre is plastered and one half of great hall tiles are inkinded. RCF visit opens possibilities for new demonstration plots and fertiliser dealership (6). Forty-five villagers participate in three-day agricultural module and took part in seminar field trip to Dhapoli Agricultural College and reflection and were excited with new possibilities for local implementation. Canara Bank celebrates opening of large new facility with loan to villagers. We have a site visit from Frank Vay of Indian Statistical Institute as part of research study for European Funding Agencies (5). Human Development Association meeting for March is held with 30 participants from seven villages and other three sectors. Shivkar Village shines with newly painted school building and grove of trees, done by 20 young people from Vashi Leo Club (young lions) and the villagers. Training Centre begins to come "alive" as work moves toward ground floor completion at the end of May for opening (4).

Internal: Great fun at Roundtable with word game which increased vocabulary of house; M. Lanphear celebrates birthday with sweets passed around breakfast table! (6). Regional Staff Women are sent out to Delhi to pioneer in six week programme of literacy, geography, Order Life and current events on behalf of all village women. Wilfred De Costa arrives in Chikhale as volunteer (5). Interchange session intensifies with all participating and writing recommendations for Global Order Organisations (4).

Contradiction: Continuing on-going tasks in the midst of moving staff to other assignments. Collecting and recording data that gives us the real picture of development in the cluster. Building a solid plan when our universe keeps shifting around us.....(Weeks 4,5,6)

External: Tree villages were visited to set up the Women's Economic Conference for week 10 and we gave toilet seats in cluster villages.

Internal: Three people were sent out to Project Journey Lab pulltogether in Maliwada in week six, and came back with Bhinrao Tupe to do the Global Interchange Model building. We got a lot of new images for the Maharashtra Village Development Project Phase IV. New block decor illuminates collegium room.

Contradiction: Maintaining continuity and momentum in the midst of the massive training and interchange task of preparation for the July/August event in Chicago. (Weeks 6,7)*

NAGPUR—THE TEMBHURWAHI HOUSE

NAGPUR—THE DABHAD HOUSE

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Four out of five Women's Centres are completed as Dutch Embassy and Save the Children make site visits for future funding and provide opportunity to declare the victory of cluster citizens. Village Muslim women leader, Batto, continues to strategically forge a new role in the cluster by attending health room duties, welcoming visitors, participating in IERD and this week going for health care training in Delhi. Huge metal sign announcing HD cluster in two languages and six bright colours, from Bata, goes up at Cluster Node. Marketing mode in Delhi begins to take advantage of IERD base and two LENSs move into the pipe line. One with company whose project was a field visit. Rapid sharing of breakthroughs and materials between Chicago, Bombay and Hong Kong key to creating marketing momentum.

Internal: Economic Foundations model material arrives from Nairobi bringing forth delighted cry "It Works"! Hard week of bouts with dysentery, heat (110F in the shade), dust storms, broken jeep and diminishing troops creates situation where even the song "It Had To Be You" breaks loose profound spirit life at weekly ritual. Being true and being blue; made to be sad and made to be glad are part of same reality: Wonderful You. Battacharyas begin trek to join Continuum in Chicago.

Contradiction: Growing clarity on the poles of Action That Really Counts and Conservative Indecision in all of us while fuzzy on keys to Radical Corporateness. (Week 5)

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Forty-two youth from Boghanhalli and Panathur sign up for Industrial Apprenticeships, under a government scheme. Government official promises to do his utmost to get them training in the area. Sue and Kate, British volunteers go to Madras for a few days to explore the possibility of spending some time with a Madras based voluntary organisation (8). After a persistent and uphill bureaucratic struggle the Mahila Mandal of Boghanhalli village is finally registered. Development teams operate in Bangalore and Madras and secure at least two solid Phase III Regional Supporting Organisations. Shiva and mother attend city hospital for training in the exercises required for his recently operated on leg (7).

Internal: City archives are sorted out in preparation for vacating the premises for the summer (8). The House visits "the Only Place" for Roundtable and the celebration of Danod Prakash's birthday, (The only place is the only place in the world to our knowledge that serves first quality large steaks for less than two dollars U.S.). Global relatedness is experienced as House listens to live broadcast of the English football (soccer) final on the radio in which the home town teams of two of the house members were playing each other (7).

Contradiction: Succumbing to the rising heat, and the July/August preoccupations. Waiting for answers from somewhere else, or waiting for the proverbial bus when you wake up to the fact that not only are you already on it, but that you are driving it. (Week 7,8)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Week long bustee Teacher Training Programme opens with 47 participants around the table (final recruitment check on day before the programme indicated no more than 30). First order of uniforms for Lipton factory is formally presented to management and union leadership by Bustee Local Committee women's industry workers amidst tea and photographs while Howrah Women Association receives first payment for uniforms from Stone India Ltd. Meeting of Beck Bagan Bustee leadership plans community clean-up workday to remove garbage heaps and receives the commitment of equipment and support from Calcutta Corporation (8). Bustee teacher training course recruitment gains momentum towards target of 30 for course opening. Guest Ken Williams grants Rs5000 for the programme, plus offer of uniform contracts for Howrah Women Association sewing industry. Second LENS implementation consultancy takes place with TISCO West Bokaro collieries, by designing three new implementation plans and raises the indicative for the next LENS (7).

Internal: OMBU critiques for Pluriform Missional Community are completed occasioning depth reflection and anticipation of July/August. Paul Sweeny and Belle Bassett are sent out to London after a three month stay. Teacher Training Course faculty departs leaving two adults and two E.G. in the House (8). The whole house's weekly event was the movie Superman III. The Prasad family left for discontinuity midweek and we had 18 hours loadshedding (power cut) in one day. Sheila hits the under 95kg mark in her diet (7).

Graduate of Grindlay's course joins GTE Team. IERD delegates meet for spirited debriefing at legislative Yuan offices. One thousand five hundred US dollars in hand toward monthly bottomlines.

External: ICA Putsan Filipino staff participated in the election of Assymilman in their respective hometowns, Elmo and Leonora Hizon family attend the farewell party in AMSF hosted by Mr. Rod Costodio and during that time Rod Costodio showed slides of the IERD in New Delhi, India. This week Mr. Salcedo the Tiwi Municipal Statistics was invited to a house meeting to facilitate Putsan Documentation, thank you letters were delivered to contributors and those who offered their services during the free clinics for PHDP "2nd anniversary.

Internal: Three persons arrived at the Tiwi House last May 16, including Miss Elizabeth Beach from Peace Corp, who gave a collegium on Marketing Analysis of Tiwi Multiple Community Development. AREA TOKYO

THE TOKYO HOUSE

External: Circuit to Fukuoka Region supports regional colleagues in doing a Town Meeting and in reviewing regional programs. All staff are fully engaged in a full week of development and volunteer symposium visits (9). Participants from the Philippine Work Camp give a slide show and report at Roundtable, 42 people are present including 25 guests. Development calls are made all week and recruitment visits are made to the key NGO groups regarding the Volunteer Symposium to be held in June. Summer preparation is experienced in a second session MBU critiques and a PSU on future possibilities for the programmatic thrust in Japan (8).

Internal: House delights in the arrival of several of the multi-community catalysis models from around the globe as Iris returns from the hospital in time for she and Gene to be sent out to Chicago for Council prep and database clean up.

Contradiction: Convincing people that now is the time for program over-against the onset of the summer "coast". (Week 6)

THE MINNEAPOLIS HOUSE

External: Two years of IERD have improved our profile in Canada such that we are able to pull off a funding luncheon in Montreal hosted by CIL at which Senator Molson speaks very affirmatively of ICA in the presence of three of the most important foundations in Canada. A six-minute video clip of interviews with colleagues who have participated in programmes this year adds to the positive atmosphere. 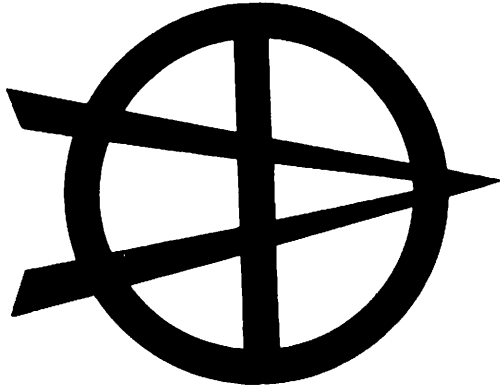

THE MADRID HOUSE

Internal: We all go on a bus trip to Windsor Castle on the rainiest Bank Holiday for 40 years even though we have to eat our picnic on a railway platform. Our Zimbabwe guests teach us some national songs.

Contradiction: Wanting to complete all our thinking when detailed care for the immediate keeps pressing. (Week 9)*

External: Meetings with Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) explore taking IERD research to development community. Yano Friedman, architect/illustrator/sociologist, agrees to read draft of IERD book. He specializes in using cartoons to make information accessible to villagers. Volunteers in five cities begin translation of Project Directory. Team finishes proposal for '84-'85 - IMAGES: LA COURNEUVE.

Internal: We send YOC papers and receive and discuss those of Phoenix, Cebu and Washington. Desmond begins editing series of 12 articles on strategies of peace from 12 countries.

Contradiction: Weaving together threads of rural and urban development (Phase III IERD and La Courneuve - our city). (Weeks 5,6)

THE FRANKFURT HOUSE

External: Two evenings with colleagues and friends were held reporting on the IERD led by participants in the India Event. A weekend looking at the next four years in light of the next 16 years reveals a deep yearning for movemental engagement intensification, in the midst of a multitude of exciting visions that yet need to be integrated and woven into a powerful myth and action.

Internal: Service Ventures contracts expand, John leaves for Rome and volunteer from the Netherlands arrives for the sojourn month, shifting us to new patterns and relationships.

Internal: Patricia takes a trip for The Canadian Embassy and visits the ICA Brobo project as well!

Contradiction: July and June travel dates are fast approaching, but we still have a million francs to raise! (Week 7)

THE LAGOS HOUSE

AREA KINSHASA

THE LUSAKA HOUSE

External: Inclusion of VLI grads in circuit teams enables us to do six circuits simultaneously. Key authorisation visit with Ministry of Social Development opens up possibility of future cooperative effort (7). Future funding possibilities open up with K800 cheque from National Energy Corporation and site visit by Canadian Embassy. Second week of May staff training event ends on high note as teams do D.O.O.P. practice in preparation for field work next week (6).

Internal: James Wambua is sent out to Nairobi en route to Chicago GRA. Andrew Weller, U.K. volunteer returns from trip to South Africa. Great 'International Cocktail' celebration is held midway through staff training programme (7). New U.K. volunteer, David Hemblade arrives after five month adventurous trip overland from Cairo to Lusaka. House welcomes first Nexus visit for year in person of Rob Jennings-Teats (6).

Contradiction: Uncoordinated cluster district, ward and funding agencies development plans. Consensing on models for circuit design, IERD follow-up event, Y.O.C. strategic organisation, in midst of focussing on May training programme. (Weeks 6,7)

AREA NAIROBI

THE NAIROBI HOUSE

External: A last minute push on the MF/TF Research responses insures we meet the June 1 deadline, but barely. Programme materials preparation for July through September catalyzes unexpected victories with 50 reams of printed village leaders training materials inked by Kenyan staff. Mauritius trip number three involves two staff in 25 days of LENS, LENS village followup and training setting up Trip no. four and the calling into being of local core.

Internal: We send out June first team of two people to Chicago at the same time 36 birth certificates are secured as first step towards other 36 passports and second orientation for 20 travellers.

Contradiction: Holding back the panic of preparation for GOC long enough to entertain the presence of the next four years. (Week 9)*

NAIROBI—THE KABIRO HOUSE

External: Two hundred Kabiro residents and chief, John Kike turn out to select the new school committee to be fully responsible for managing the Kabiro School including handling all money matters. The Family Planning International evaluation takes place and Dr. Pope interviews everyone at the scope of a clinic that does gardens, rabbit raising, family planning, education for adults in health and children in 900 student school, pipes in clean water, mounts community sign board, sponsors a soccer team and is "the best clinic of its type" (for family planning) he has ever seen. The Kabiro residents say no to experienced (4 years) staff leaving, no to experienced staff (even one with three years experience as a Project Director) staying on in July and no to finding responsible residents who can guard the compound but then decides they do self government (madaeaka) if they can consult with the management office and put off Vhuru (independence) until next year.

Internal: Sam and Ester Were take their children to Grandmother's home for the next three months as Nixon returns from the coast and Rose returns from a family issues meeting .

Contradiction: How do we arrange to maintain this project in July and August. (Week 9)*

NAIROBI-THE KALWANI-SHAMALAGO HOUSE

External: Fourteen villages are circuited. Development and Inkind team inkinded 36 spoons, 41 sign boards, one gallon of paint, two bundles of maize flour, one sack of rice and a generator repair (cost of 3,100 Kenyan shillings). Saboti HDP expanded to sublocation with nine villages (8). Saboti Impact is held with 123 participants. Section "A" maneuver team holds orientation and National Youth Service agreed to give transport for the Sango Sign boards (7).

Internal: House painted three rooms, transplanted 100 cabbages, as well as tomatoes, onions, and carrots in the House. House sends Gautam Gosavi out to Nairobi (8). The impact team returns from Saboti. Madaraka Day is celebrated with House olympics trial (7).

Contradiction: Having circuits while fundraising is on the move engaging every person in the nation. Anticipating short comings in schedules to maximise circuits effectivity. (Week 7,8)*

External: The new Maliwada Gram Panchayat starts its term by repairing tap water systems in the village. Daulatadad percolation dam opens whilst in Karodi the construction of another dam is underway to potentially irrigate six villages. In Rampuri a borewell is dug, finding water at 300 ft. and providing Rampuri with its first clean water supply. Maliwada's Laxman Devatkar gets 50% loan for a Rs.50,000 new sawmill whilst in Jambala six farmers receive loans for cows and goats. Jambala also sees the completion of its community centre and the sanctioning of rs2,000 for its preschool. In Wanjawadi the villagers pay a teacher from a neighbouring village to start Wanjawadi's first preschool with a class of 40 children. Meanwhile in Maliwada the Buddhist community celebrated "Buddha Purnima" and showed an Ambedkar movie.

Internal: The House is hosted at 'Peerbaba' mutton celebration in Abidmandi. Ramesh Ye'shankar is sent out to Panvel for self-support sign-writing, and an English collegium and class is led by guest John L'Anson.

Contradiction: Relating work of week eight to work of week 10 while team participates in week nine Regional Training. (Week 7)

BOMBAY—THE CHIKHALE HOUSE

External: Chikhale tap water is turned on as other water dries upFirst wall of training centre is plastered and one half of great hall tiles are inkinded. RCF visit opens possibilities for new demonstration plots and fertiliser dealership (6). Forty-five villagers participate in three-day agricultural module and took part in seminar field trip to Dhapoli Agricultural College and reflection and were excited with new possibilities for local implementation. Canara Bank celebrates opening of large new facility with loan to villagers. We have a site visit from Frank Vay of Indian Statistical Institute as part of research study for European Funding Agencies (5). Human Development Association meeting for March is held with 30 participants from seven villages and other three sectors. Shivkar Village shines with newly painted school building and grove of trees. done by 20 young people from Vashi Leo Club (young lions) and the villagers. Training Centre begins to come "alive" as work moves toward ground floor completion at the end of May for opening (4).

Internal: Great fun at Roundtable with word game which increased vocabulary of house; M. Lanphear celebrates birthday with sweets passed around breakfast table! (6). Regional Staff Women are sent out to Delhi to pioneer in six week programme of literacy, geography. Order Life and current events on behalf of all village women. Wilfred De Costa arrives in Chikhale as volunteer (5). Interchange session intensifies with all participating and writing recommendations for Global Order Organisations (4).

Contradiction: Continuiing on-going tasks in the midst of moving staff to other assignments. Collecting and recording data that gives us the real picture of development in the cluster. Building a solid plan when our universe keeps shifting around us.....(Weeks 4,5,6)

External: Tree villages were visited to set up the Women's Economic Conference for week 10 and we gave toilet seats in cluster villages.

Internal: Three people were sent out to Project Journey Lab pulltogether in Maliwada in week six, and came back with Bhinrao Tupe to do the Global Interchange Model building. We got a lot of new images for the Maharashtra Village Development Project Phase IV. New block decor illuminates collegium room.

Contradiction: Maintaining continuity and momentum in the midst of the massive training and interchange task of preparation for the July/August event in Chicago. (Weeks 6,7)

AREA DELHI

THE DELHI HOUSE

External: Dutch grant for demonstration wells come in at Rs. 116,000. Well in Harijan Community in Khori has three pumps installed and villagers are now building the covering dome. Three day meetings result in Muslims making their well available for Harijans during rebuilding, thus turning a few hundred years of history in a slightly new direction. Delhi colleagues continue regular meetings, chalking up three last week to complete programme proposal for the government of the State of Haryana for Phase III. Nairobi flies in their proposal as a resource. Dr. Sharma and Venita joins team to Chandigarh to present proposal to the government. Fifty returned interest cards from across the Area request Phase III programmes and training in ICA methods. Food specialties (Nestles) request Design Conference for fall LENS.

Internal: Mr. Dethe is sent out to represent Area at Chicago. Ten more on their way through met briefly at the airport. Luncheon (ours) and cocktail party (theirs) sends out Jeanette Wildeboer, wife of First Secretary of Dutch Embassy, after one and a half years of volunteer work in Chaurassi Cluster. Debra Harris, a nurse who was met on a train, crossed over from tourist to four-month volunteer to YOC July/August participant is sent out.

Contradiction: Keeping the "heat on" during oppressive heat wave while praying for the cooling monsoons which mustn't come because they'll block work on wells, road and drains. (Week 9)*

AREA MADRAS

THE BANGALORE HOUSE

External: Forty-two youth from Boghanhalli and Panathur sign up for Industrial Apprenticeships, under a government scheme. Government official promises to do his utmost to get them training in the area. Sue and Kate, British volunteers go to Madras for a few days to explore the possibility of spending some time with a Madras based voluntary organisation (8). After a persistent and uphill bureaucratic struggle the Mahila Mandal of Boghanhalli village is finally registered. Development teams operate in Bangalore and Madras and secure at least two solid Phase III Regional Supporting Organisations. Shiva and mother attend city hospital for training in the exercises required for his recently operated on leg (7).

Internal: City archives are sorted out in preparation for vacating the premises for the summer (8). The House visits "the Only Place" for Roundtable and the celebration of Danod Prakash's birthday. (The only place is the only place in the world to our knowledge that serves first quality large steaks for less than two dollars U.S.). Global relatedness is experienced as House listens to live broadcast of the English football (soccer) final on the radio in which the home town teams of two of the house members were playing each other (7).

Contradiction: Succumbing to the rising heat, and the July/August preoccupations. Waiting for answers from somewhere else, or waiting for the proverbial bus when you wake up to the fact that not only are you already on it, but that you are driving it. (Week 7,8)

AREA CALCUTTA

THE CALCUTTA HOUSE

External: Week long bustee Teacher Training Programme opens with 47 participants around the table (final recruitment check on day before the programme indicated no more than 30). First order of uniforms for Lipton factory is formally presented to management and union leadership by Bustee Local Committee women's industry workers amidst tea and photographs while Howrah Women Association receives first payment for uniforms from Stone India Ltd. Meeting of Beck Bagan Bustee leadership plans community clean-up workday to remove garbage heaps and receives the commitment of equipment and support from Calcutta Corporation (8). Bustee teacher training course recruitment gains momentum towards target of 30 for course opening. Guest Ken Williams grants Rs5000 for the programme, plus offer of uniform contracts for Howrah Women Association sewing industry.
