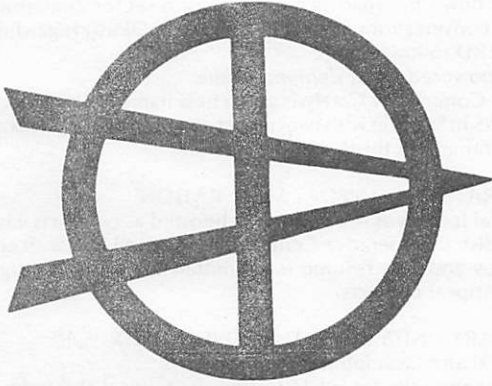

PRIORITIES REPORT

21 PRIMARY UNITS GLOBALLY COVENANTED

The Brussels Primary Unit held our second Primary Unit check signals meeting for the year. Our second meeting but only the first with nearly all assigned staff here. We had a great time struggling to articulate and become a "globally covenanted Primary Unit." The struggle was more in the arena of "covenant" than geography.

STRATEGIC COLLABORATIVE TRAINING

The month-long volunteers training programme in Brussels came to a close and the six volunteers treated us to a tremendous cabaret that had us all laughing at ourselves. The volunteer training programme in London was run by the twelve volunteers themselves as all of the staff attended the check signals meeting.

Service Ventures received a request for a proposal to teach group planning methods to the telephone company of the Netherlands. Self support projection indicates we will be meeting the bottomline by the end of December.

MAJOR CHALLENGE

Preparing the foundations for this year in terms of programmes and development.

ORDER NEWS

House sitting keeps us financially alive until the first pay cheques arrive. Family and friends in Abidjan hear the story of the Council.

PRIORITIES REPORT

INTEGRATED IERD PHASE III ACTIVITIES

Agricultural surveys in nine cluster villages reveal an urgent need for training. A subsequent visit to the Ministry of Agriculture results in the promise of seeds, fruit trees and fertilizer needed to create a new demonstration house garden. CIDA and Minister of Health visit precede a much needed K.H.D.P. Community Development Association meeting which discussed windmill, the forthcoming Lions Health Fair and hiring out the community tractor.

CORPORATE SELF SUPPORT MATURATION

Elaine Telfor, Cliff and Carl Stocking receive essential work permits. Breakthru occurs as Mr. Sikambe (political Secretary) agrees to write cover letter for all new staff still awaiting entry. Meanwhile, Sele self support receives a boost as Kay Schnizlein brings home K1,050 per month.

MAJOR CHALLENGE

Looking at the broader perspective as well as the local as the local.

ORDER NEWS

Agnes Muyale eagerly participates in a two week revolutionary planned parenthood seminar. Michelle Telford arrives in time to celebrate her 19th birthday with her parents. (Week 1,2)*

NAIROBI PRIMARY UNIT

PRIORITIES REPORT

INTEGRATED IERD PHASE III ACTIVITIES

-Empowered MCC Demonstrations

Framing and authorization visits are made to district officers, chiefs, sub-chiefs, and village leaders as part of launching the New Division Initiative Opportunity (N.D.I.O.) and preparing for all-sector care alliances (3). Lingo pushes Integrated IERD Phase III down the road as appointment is set for Zimbabwe trip and conversations are held with Daniel Okusu regarding Ghana IERD follow up (4).

-Empowered MCC demonstrations

Multiple Community Catalysis gets a new name NDIO (which means YES in Swahili) with two impact programmes and village leaders training in three sections.

CORPORATE SELF SUPPORT MATURATION

New Local Initiatives self-support is boosted as contracts with the Swedish Co-operative Centre to fund nine LENS with co-operatives and first resume is submitted for a job through Annual Appeal contacts.

21 PRIMARY UNITS GLOBALLY COVENANTED

-Fiscal and Development

Development visits are made to church, political and federal funding services in Germany and the Ministry of Health Grant is confirmed. David and Lynda Zahrt arrive and bring a Kaypro 2 computer which is already put to work in management. Primary Unit Priory treks visit Kamweleni and Vwevvesi Programme Houses (3). Nairobi Primary Unit is linked to other 21 as Bergdalls bring news from Chicago, Tokyo, Hong Kong, Bombay and Chikale (4).

MAJOR CHALLENGE

The Nairobi Primary Unit is challenged to set the context of the NDIO programme in order that the Leap it represents will become the natural burden of the New Village Movement staff and District Frames (3). Much needed rain in Kenya slows down the village circuits and consults because people are working in the fields (4).

ORDER NEWS

Charles and Kaira Lingo and youths George Hawley, and David Lindblad arrive just in time to help finish painting the House, celebrate Kenyatta Day and three birthdays; Lloyd Philbrook, Lois Were (3 year olds) and Therese Norton (10 years old). We all celebrate the Hindu Festival of Lights (Diwali) featuring a candle light story of the legendary (And therefore true) heros recalled by the celebration by Gyan Prakash and Psaulina Prakash. PRIORITIES REPORT

CORPORATE SELF SUPPORT MATURATION

Corporate self support maturation launched the year by releasing 100% stipend on new Rs150/month/adult by using income earned during July-September. Bombay held two LENS courses and confirmed two more plus another training event. Self-support teams in all four locations are actively looking for jobs with some earnings in hand in Chikhale and Jawale.

MAJOR CHALLENGE

Structuring the four Programme Houses - Chikhale, Bombay, Jawale and Pune - so that everybody participates in the mission everyday - avoiding images of Nexus, Centrum, ashrams and an Area team.

ORDER NEWS

All families in Jawale opened savings accounts; all people assigned overseas have left for their new locations: Brussels, Kenya, Philippines and Chicago. (Week 2)*

CORPORATE SELF SUPPORT MATURATION

-New Local Initiatives

New self-support possibility opens up with rental of the second floor in our building, making ground floor into residential programme space. Initial ICA and House budget is completed, along with programme and development income plans.

MAJOR CHALLENGE

Building September momentum to ensure programme and development income during October festival time and beyond.

ORDER NEWS

House rejoices in arrival of Phase I baby boy born to Phase II family Shivnath and Anju Prasad, and arrival of Phase III couple, the Lachmans, in Calcutta. (Week 11)

CORPORATE SELF-SUPPORT MATURATION

Consultations team begins marketing blitz of Effective Supervisors Course with seven appointments. Workshop is held with Chinese participant and first English student is secured.

SOCIO-SPIRIT RESEARCH NETWORK

The House experiments with new ritual during the week with a Saturday workshop to create a new Daily Ritual.

PILGRIMAGE TOWARDS THE YEAR 2000

Team is named to be guides for the pilgrimage after a workshop on site selection suggests journeying by boat, bus and foot to view first western settlement in China, Buddhist Monastery and the border of China.

MAJOR CHALLENGE

Continuing to create stable foundations as an Anchor House and networks in the midst of sending representatives to other Primary Unit Councils and hosting the Continental Check Signals meeting preparation.

SOCIO-SPIRIT RESEARCH NETWORK

House has grace experience in midst of collegium on ritual and comes up with temporary interim transitional daily form we all like! We also struggle through creating a Roundtable construct that combines news analysis, cultural/spirit research, solitary exercise, and skills training, and set date for series.

CORPORATE SELF-SUPPORT MATURATION

Three-hour program with TPP (Taiwan Polypropylene), a Design Conference of sorts, for \$750.US, is set for November 20 with company Operations V.P.

21 PRIMARY UNITS GLOBALLY COVENANTED

We begin to transform collegium room as new Taiwan map (in English) and the Earth in space are framed, and Lito produces watercolor "Planetary People".

MAJOR CHALLENGE

Allowing everyone to appropriate experience of major culture shock as a "learning experience" that discloses possibility and an open future.

ORDER NEWS

G. Harper is sent out to SEAPAC check signals meeting in Hong Kong. Shao Kuang gets a puppy! Our Daily Ritual consists of Singing, a reading (We're using the Tao Te ching), a five minute silence, a "witness" (one person to reflect on his or her thoughts during silent period), corporate reflection (anyone so moved may speak) and a repeat of the reading. (Week 5)*

TOKYO PRIMARY UNIT

PRIORITIES REPORT

CORPORATE SELF-SUPPORT MATURATION

Roundtable emphasis upon visualization receives additional stimulus with regional colleague doing a visualization which is used in teaching English as a foreign language. Sojourners Ann St. John (USA) and Alice Edwards (England) procure new teaching positions allowing them full economic participation in House finances. Training Center announces profit and possible gift to ICA. Sapporo trek proposal for November includes solid financial feasibility (3).

STRATEGIC COLLABORATIVE TRAINING

Osaka House conducts one day (ten Hours!) planning meeting with a small shoe company in Hiroshima; company provides two-way transportation as well as lucrative fee for the event. Tokyo House and Paul Muriyama lead the third Town Meeting in Tooi Machi; meeting raises the question of further plans for

a town in which local consciousness has been significantly raised through Town Meetings. In-House advanced English class continues involving participants in opportunities for further refinement in movement methods (4).

Holding the tension between all immediate requirements for a small house move, the long term planning, and keeping the projects ticking over.

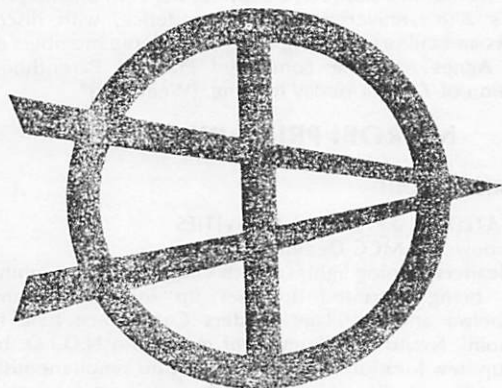

Making it all work...After designing new teams and systems for nearly every dimension of our corporate life, the challenge is to seriously test our models with our lives.

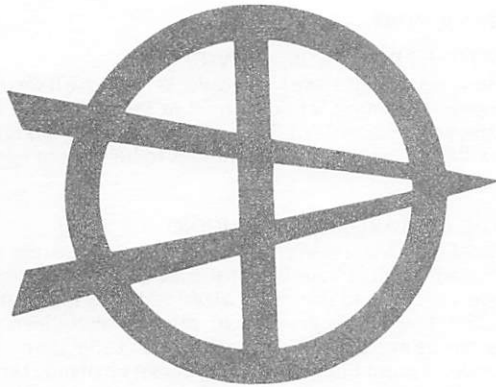

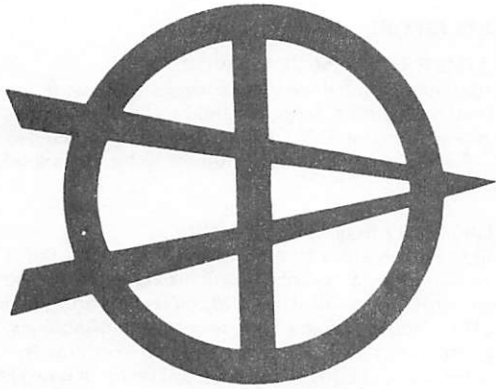

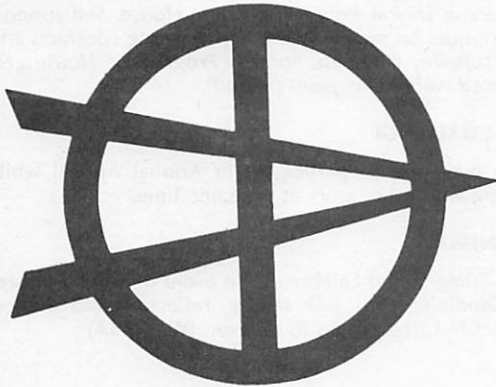
