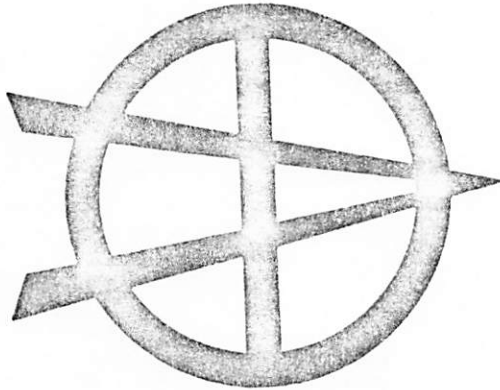

Collaborative work lights up with national newspaper reporting presentation of block-making machine to Kabiro by the World Council of Religion and Peace. The World Council of Religion and Peace sends 80 people (one-sixth of the Conference) to visit two project sites and promises to fund one project at each site and give more help in the future.

Sixth Anniversary Celebration on July 31 in Langub begins with Mass said by Fr. Pol Dagangun, and is fun! fun! as 200 plus community people feast and dance. Special visitors include Goodyear Branch manager Mr. Llaban, Mrs. Bragadean of RMC and students, and the representative of the city mayor Attorney Capili. Donations include 30 pots of roses, 200 Santan plants, loan of 100 chairs. In preparation for the anniversary, the development team meets the City Engineer for approval of the proposal for Langub road maintenance and finds a printer for 50% discount on invitation letters. A very joyful 6th anniversary!

Tiwi Municipal Mayor's visitors from MECS in each region visit the Putsan Human Development Project.

All-Sector Care Alliances

Health is spotlighted across Manila with free clinics in Bagong Dalan, in Sudtonggan with doctors from Lapu-Lapu City, in Matumbo on Mactan Island, with the Ministry of Health and the Sariling Sikap Movement in Langub. The Tiwi Municipal nutritionist, accompanied by the Rural Health Midwife, distribute corn soya milk to third degree malnourished children in Putsan. Cebu house visits with all doctors from the District of Cordova and Lapu-Lapu City to schedule the remaining free clinics which are being held in coordination with the City Nutrition Committee and the ICA. Free medicines help in the effort with a quarterly donation of two boxes to Cebu from the Provincial Health Office, four types of medicines to Manila from Merrell Dow Pharmaceutical, Inc. and medicine to Putsan Health Center from AH Robins Pharmaceutical. As an alternative to medical supplies which run short, Putsan HDP team is working on preparation of herbal medicine for substitution and doctors in Cebu are invited to a Quarter II conference on herbal medicine.
