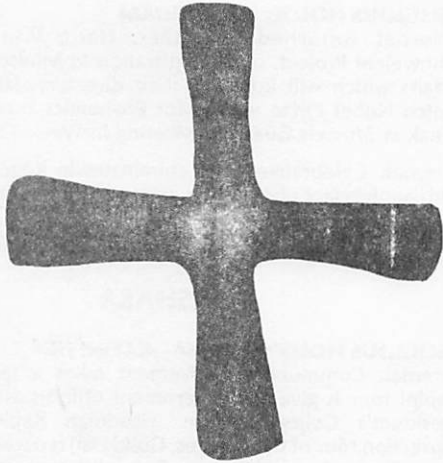

## LONDON

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Senator Molson (Canada) contact, Lord Harding in London offers help with 10,000 dollars and new contacts.

Internal: Area troop deployment sends out youth Ian Grow to Tair'gwaith and Colin Murphy to Glasgow.

Contradiction: Rushing towards victory with unclear models and symbols. (Wk.5)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: One week of metro circuits transforms metro with least possibility of victory into metro with most possibility as Dundee Metro comes alive and colleague Alan McGilivray hosts areal circuit team of Stuart Hampton and Carroll Smith with fine spirits. Mary Murphy joins the team from London to add the necessary finesse.

Internal: The campaign command post goes into full operation and caps the week with an extended ecclesiola (two days) and a fine Week II celebration that is joined by our next door neighbors who participate in a three hour games construct.

Contradiction: Getting optimum mileage out of ourselves while honoring both our timeline and the fixed schedules of other community structures. (Wk.6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAIR'GWAITH HDP

External: Work begins on foundation of community building with contractor on site. Circuiting to three metros nets dates set for three events in Bristol.

Internal: Danny lands new job. Ian Grow arrives in time to celebrate birthday and go on metro circuit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the role of and need for TM and HDP in the United Kingdom. (Wk.6)

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External Circuit into two metros uncovers old and new colleagues and puts into motion events for those metros.

Internal: Feet on the table sessions with old colleagues in Newcastle dramatizes the firm foundation on which the movement in the UK was built.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between strong individual authorization and structural network support. (Wk.6)

## MADRID

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Exciting trek to Extramadura Region with three crucial TM set-up meetings: with a group in Jaraiz (and a CYF complete with Global slide show), with a team of three priests in Miajdas who promise a TM set in neighboring villages in March, with a functioning cadre in Berzocana.

Internal: House makes second visit to key Spanish lawyer who paves way for ICA registration as a foundation in Spain.

Contradiction: Finding Spanish colleagues immediately for the upcoming treks. (Wk.6)

## PARIS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Two circuit teams, a Day I House presence and a Week II circuit by permeators result in 19 events scheduled in five metro sets. Global Operations and Research Centurms trek breaks open Week II area remaneuvering to articulate the major thrust of the quarter — Paris Metro.

Internal: House Church is a profound event with four Benedictine nuns as guests, two of whom are from Erie Pa.

Contradiction: Creating symbols for the urban that sustain the risking dynamic. (Wk.6)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Vivian Paul arrives to join Development Centrum.

Internal: Host six guests at Ecclesiola. Begin recruitment of Formation Fortnight, now being called "Primal Community: The Next Decade", Europe's two week training event scheduled for Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Cross centrum moves, to enable events of quarter, such as Guardians Meeting, to be set up, recruited, and enabled, while not one in Research and Operations for three weeks during day ones. (Wk. 6)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Gent (urban) and Le Chesne (rural) sets hold plenaries and planned miracles. Recieves 2000 copies of 1978-79 National Report inkinded from IBM.

Internal: Six guests at ecclesiola stay until collegium the next morning, one attends Area Council in Paris.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in Brussels region including office duties while getting all regions in the area activated. (Wk. 5)

### ROME

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Twenty-five people from one village come together to discuss set-up plans and choose eight people to be trained for the coming set.

Internal: The Profound Humanness chart has House struggling with what it means to have poetry and life experience grounded in it.

Contradiction: Organizing scheduling and logistics so that solid eventfulness and momentum emerge. (Wk. 6)

### LAGOS

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: Miraculous intervention of Professor Udekwo rescinds repatriation order on two and reactivates process of registration. Mufutan Jimoh, Sewing Factory manager, gets new contracts - one with possible total of \$38,400 (N24,000). Key TM held at Umuzike-Orlu, Imo State with 300 present, led by two auxiliary and two Ijedians.

Internal: House celebrates arrival of Ray Spencer, Neil Vance and Bill Parker. with fantastic Saturday night feast and great House Church.

Contradiction: Enabling events in the village which create corporateness and sustain consistent victories. (Wk. 6)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Gerald Nani, French Guardian joins Biel on two-week framing and authorization trek through West. Africa.

Internal: Suzanne completes hospital stay and starts back to work again.

Contradiction: Doing comprehensive job on base maneuvers without having the benefit of corporate input. (Wk. 5)

### FRANKFURT

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: The first of six sets in the Koln Region is begun with an afternoon forum and a training session well attended by youth and a Guardian couple the card file of over 2000 past contacts is reviewed and coded to indicate activity in the past three years and uncovers more possibility than can be kept "in mind." One student volunteer leaves for India and two more come to talk about going to Canada.

Internal: Encounter of area strike force with the House reveals how quickly the universe shifts and dramatizes that a different man returns to a different house.

Contradiction: Focusing on priorities that will result in programs and allow victory amidst complex permeation schedules. (Wk. 6)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Community leads the whole quarterly planning and After-School-Program—Teachers participate in curriculam building.

Internal: Mike Deloughery gets residence permit for one year and house sets up space and decor for extension trek.

Contradiction: Continuing to build momentum in the midst of extension when there is no concrete image allowing the leap into the future. (Wk. 4)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Returned volunteer, Haric Von Rosmalen, Kamweleni Project, sends registration to Ministry of Foreign Affairs which will list us in their directory. Jan Tinbergen, Dutch Nobel Prize winner for Economics confirms he will speak at Brussels Guardian Meeting in Week 12.

Internal: Celebrative week culminates in Rozendal family's 10th anniversary observation and strike force sendout.

Contradiction: Using new advantages to break loose awakenment campaign. (Wk. 6)

### KINSHASA

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Community involvement takes a leap as grand Kapini tour is given to government officials as apt of their President's College course. Headman Kapini leads an inspection tour of the 20 acres. Guild Hall is packed for Village Council meeting and Finance Commission meets for the first time.

Internal: Festive candlelight congregational dinner held to celebrate the coming marriage to Eusebio Muloshi and Felisters Mulenga.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between the community's new 1980 decisions and the heavy work needed to put them into action. (Wk. 6)

### CAIRO

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE :CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Project focus on visibility pushes teams to make miracles in the new marmalade factory, Stake 5 toilet, milk distribution and securing date for first GWF with Cairo Women's Club.

Internal: New leadership emerges in the House as staff women take responsibility for Week II miracles.

Contradiction: Using the gift of 60 student volunteers to enable building the new community center that will house Bayad assemblies, guild meetings and the preschool. (Wk. 6)

### NAIROBI

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Ulatya village residents experience great week of Consult with the tent as a gathering place and a generator giving new light as key components. Dancing all night each night of the consult symbolizes excitement of community and their readiness to begin the journey of being a demonstration village in Kenya Replication. Fifty development contacts made in three days as drops in produce more appointments than the telephone. G.D. Bros agrees to contribute half of the building panels and transport of building for HDTI in Kamweleni. Kabiro residents have great opening event for quarterly planning with many new faces and great participation. Key contradicions named were absence of necessary materials and total community participation.

Internal: Send out of troops to Machakos District to move on replication: set up Kilisa consult and HDTI and all Nigerian and Zambian colleagues plug into development and training school faculty.

Contradiction: Holding the corporate of the whole mission and the focused power of each part. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP**

External: Marcel's community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

## BOMBAY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP**

External: Women's Advancement Module training held for 30 ICA staff women and three Sevagram HDP village women in preparation for five 5-day modules in district projects this quarter creates a new vision and sense of collegiality among the women of Nava Gram Prayas. First impact and GRA recruitment foray to Jabalpur reopens that region to the movement.

Internal: Global Methods School PSU creates the means to convey the depth of the internal life to the 25 district projects while HDTI recruitment teams hold collegiums on daily ritual and demonstrate use of the *Internal Life Guide*.

Contradiction: How to ensure participation of key village leadership in upcoming HDTI. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS**

External: 35-CCA Status of I.C.A.: INDIA was renewed marking a great victory for this quarter. 1979 ended with raising and depositing of Rs. 90,000 on the last day. Nexus participated in Continental Council, Area Bombay Council and the Global Research Band Meeting, all held at Maliwada and are great spiritizing events for the villagers, auxiliary and global colleagues.

Internal: House sends out H.S. Gavai, Stan Gibson and Vaughan O'Halloran to Brussels for Global Development Band Meeting, Brian Robins and Dierdre Dowsett to Chicago for Global Operations Band Meeting, and Vinod Parekh to Latin America on Panchayat Trek.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on our advantages and disadvantages to move into this new quarter with strength. (Wk. 5)

## DELHI

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP**

External: White washing temple catalyzes 200 strong village meeting. Successful health camp and first 'spontaneous' village workday.

Internal: House receives inkind blankets, medicine and clothes for winter colds and flu and is released to new engagement.

Contradiction: Ensuring project momentum is maintained through end of quarter discontinuity and Continental Council. (Wk. 1)

## MADRAS

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP**

External: Nadlapur housing program continues to attract public attention as the district sub-collector and then a group of officials from the Federal government housing and Hyderabad Urban Development Corporation visit the project.

Internal: House celebrates Sankratke (thanksgiving) by eating a big chicken and hosts Kamela Parekh.

Contradiction: Systematizing leadership training efforts. (Wk. 6)

## CALCUTTA

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Four Community Youth Forums in Dhanbad in two days with 280 participants and three people as co-ordinators. Discovering concrete ways of breaking open Calcutta City with impact.

Internal: With the first roundtable of the quarter and a Gram Sabha training event in the house, the house has begun to work with Bengali people.

Contradiction: Creating the imaginal pictures that allow the naming of the bottom line in the impact and site selection arenas. (Wk. 6)

## SINGAPORE

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS**

External: Bubun and Sungai Lui guests visit for discontinuity. Mail out 100 invitations for January Guardians event and began receiving "yes" response.

Internal: House disperses to mountains and beaches for discontinuity.

Contradiction: Moving confidently into Quarter III without having done Nexus planning. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP**

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI HDP**

External: Whole house travels to Area Council in Bubun. All houses and Nexus participate in receiving regional reports and Continental Council report. Fifty six participants from HDTs in Bubun return to be part of Council and plan Quarter III. New Assignments and commissioning of training school grads is highlighted by presentation of story, song, and symbol done the day before.

Internal: Staff returns to Sungai Lui to find that the Education Guild has already met and made plans for starting up the preschool and even secures another location.

Contradiction: Creating the regional design that will ensure victory in self-support, project extension and establishing an operating base in new geography. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Key leader of Ministry of Home Affairs helps ICA to strengthen national and provincial frames. Nurada kicks off construction of community center with 50-person Gotong Royong workday. Land deal is negotiated by villagers and government.

Internal: A. Paul's baby girl arrives three weeks early, just 12 hours after Antony arrives on the scene from Bubun.

Contradiction: Realizing government decision in December to enable extension in September, 1980, while at the same time intensifying the demonstration so that every local government office will beg for extension. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**  
External: The Great Week of Visits; Mr. Yang Lumberman visits Hai Ou and offers wood for all doors on Community Centre and Cement Co. donates 200 bags of cement and expresses interest in LENS.

Internal: House tribal resettlement increases anticipation over new assignments to Bontoa; village understands assignment of three families to Bubun and Kelapa Dua as Bontoa's gift to the national development scheme.

Contradiction: Prioritizing short range tasks in preparation for comprehensive village planning and to imaginably see the rain as an ally rather than being paralyzed by it. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP**  
External: Exciting reports and snapshots from villagers arriving from Bubun HDTs creates expectancy for HDTs Bontoa. Teachers finish sewing new uniforms with the help of village mothers. New curriculum planned for the month.

Internal: Arrival of three university students swells house number to four while the rest are at the Area Council in Bubun, Sumatra.

Contradiction: Building long range plan for village actuation and expansion in the midst of planting season and end of government fiscal year. (Wk. 1)

## HONG KONG

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**  
External: Caltex gift of HK\$10,000 signals continued support. Kaohsiung Lens signals the launching of quarter programs.

Internal: Research, Development and Operations Band Meeting reports bring fresh images of task and a recontexting on the globe.

Contradiction: Unforged image of centrums function in active missional program become conduit for Summer. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**  
External: Site visit from Canadian Club wins \$5000HK for English as Second Language equipment to be installed in primary school.

Internal: House attends feast celebrating of new Shing House.

Contradiction: Planning programs in Hong Kong that takes into account the development of South China. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**  
External: The Great Week of Visits; Mr. Yang Lumberman visits Hai Ou and offers wood for all doors on Community Centre and Cement Co. donates 200 bags of cement and expresses interest in LENS.

Internal: Zaphr Denner staff of LENS visits Hai Ou participating in House structures and western members of House receive alien registration cards.

Contradiction: How to handle the implementation details of the Transition Model while resources are thinly stretched. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**  
External: 43 Development calls made. Goal for January, \$70,000, will be secure by middle of month meeting with 2nd man at U.S. Embassy leads to appointment with Ambassador. Contacts with Japanese companies leads toward decision to participate and opening of the new network.

Internal: House attends Japanese Opera company production of Madame Butterfly and movie of Force of One brings home reflection on necessity of US to upgrade exports.

Contradiction: Carrying programs to next depth. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**  
External: The Great Week of Visits; Mr. Yang Lumberman visits Hai Ou and offers wood for all doors on Community Centre and Cement Co. donates 200 bags of cement and expresses interest in LENS.

Internal: HK development staff visit Hai Ou. Peter Hu returns from Chicago Academy, three staff arrive for LENS marketing and Week II LENS with Kaohsiung Monomer Co.

Contradiction: Expanding current human development training phase from demonstration programs to geographically spread development movement. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP**  
External: Hammers and saws buzz as Island Demonstration monthly focus materializes with the beginning of new and expanded ELC building for Sudtonggan and many of the Mactan 24 with Parents Associations finding wood and mails under houses. Blue shirts approach Cebu business community with story of 1200 malnourished children to inkind ELC nutritious snacks. Government paymaster of Lapu Lapu City greeted with great joy at Division meetings as first bimonthly honorarium is released to village workers.

Internal: Cluster City (Cebu House) reorganizes as our number go over 30 with tribal resettlement, redecorating collegium room, office set up, recreation room establishment and ends week with workday building parking lot and playing volleyball.

Contradiction: Expanding beyond vehicle of village preschool and the crush of immediacies of next week to deal with the whole village and plan the coming month. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**  
External: New baseline data surveys completed in all six HDPs. Brokenshire Hospital approves sending doctor and medical team to all six HDPs on a weekly rotation. Sewing Industry payroll hits 2000 plus and National Manpower training center hires Langub seamstress to train 70 new women for the Sewing Industry.

Internal: Herminia Banayo arrives for new assignment and new Internal Life model goes into effect.

Contradiction: A way to get to all the HDPs in rain, fog or mud. (Wk. 6)

## TOKYO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**  
External: Director of Local Government Research and Data Center provides excellent introductions to senior officials in six prefectures. Saitama prefecture official visits the House. 1979 Town Meeting Report is written and printed.

Internal: Two day House meeting plans the quarter including a maneuver to recruit new staff. Advisors dinner on Thursday discusses the broad picture of human development in Japan.

Contradiction: Coordinating short-term and long-term activity in one pivot prefecture, four stronghold prefectures, two flank prefectures and four satellite prefectures. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP**  
External: Experimental series of declaration missions is completed with twelfth in Sang Yang Ri.

Internal: Passage film impacts House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythm while dancing so close to the edge. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**  
External: USAID (army surplus) initiative yields 12 seat sports van and if and as available, up to \$500,000 (acquisition value) of other property, and 15 set appointments set for development week.

Internal: Permeation pays as school colleague leads us to best house possibility yet, and young lawyer introduces recent university grad to Jeju sojourn and likely internship.

Contradiction: Maintaining interior gentility while the world and the external mission writhe and rage. (Wk. 5)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP**

External: Old quarters are renovated for the dairy cows and 10 new beef cattle are purchased.

Internal: Personal quarters and corporate kitchen freeze solid, two days without running water (-4°F).

Contradiction: Discerning next move now that troops are ready. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: House continues development and raises \$250. Nagasaki's 18 impact events are confirmed. A volunteer continues setting up development calls. January 12 receives boost with 75 people at Year End Party at ICA.

Internal: After Year End Party, volunteers stay over, Karikosis came to visit, and 13 sit down for breakfast the next day.

Contradiction: Sustaining the momentum during the Holiday Season and planning for the next six months. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: Nara presentation was attended by Soical Ed directors from every community in the prefecture. Two directors who had sponsored TM last year stood up and gave testimony, and a third director scheduled a TM for Spring. We now have both feet in the door at Nara Ishikawa Prefecture turns gold as Uchinado-cho has its TM.

Internal: With two ICA staff out on the road, the scurry is to cover the English classes and a new modeling appointment.

Contradiction: Keeping the image of being the corporate one when so much of one's time is spent as the solitary. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP**

External: Three Town Meetings scheduled in Hokkaido with agriculture, Social Education department of a city government and a third with church groups. Oyubari businessmen pledge 10% seed money for ski lift. Youth group begin work on March Show Festival. Oyubari groups raise 10,000 yen for Indian projects. Appointments scheduled with vice-governor and with business consultant guardian for month of February.

Internal: Six visitors strengthen translation for businessmen's meeting. Washing machine in-kind from garbage pile doubles house washing capacity.

Contradiction: Making our plan for getting out on the road without taking counsel of our fears. (Wk. 5)

### **SYDNEY**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Second great assault takes place on the new Australian myth through preparing, procuring, printing and stuffing of 700 ICA Newsletters, including grassroots development appeal to 283. Names 12 tracking towns for corporate Research project.

Internal: Great House Christmas Party includes corporate feast (everyone makes his or her own favorite dish). Christmas carols, gift exchange and combined musical talent heretofore unheard.

Contradiction: Becoming entangled from the claims of Quarter II in order to get the jump on Quarter. III. (Wk. 1)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

External: First set of nine towns is chosen for March campaign and Week II circuit is set up. Bob Hawley sent to Adelaide to participate in campaign.

Internal: Landlord cheers as front of House is primed, ready for top coat.

Contradiction: Building the confidence in the model to prepare our set for a rash of CMAs in March. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

External: Regional Council with 14 around the table and Jaycees community meeting presentation with fine witness by Guardian signal beginning of quarter's maneuvers.

Internal: Ben Chapman and Bob Hawley arrive, Ben to join the House for remainder of the year and Bob to help with Lower Murray campaign.

Contradiction: L. Need of community meeting campaign story that will release powerful engagement. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Murrin Bridge Industry PSU phoning sets up one new Guardian family to help with marketing, colleague visits to house midweek and input to Victoria CMA strategy. Sr. Marie Bourke of Nathalia visits and says yes to working in Portland in March. Christmas grassroots mailing nets \$100 in post so far.

Internal: Telford, Oakley and Otto hosted for PSU and all celebrate Australia Day with Australian poems and stories amidst planning.

Contradiction: Focusing our missional passion in midst of complexity of the task. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP**

External: Holiday Youth Program begins Coonchie Corporation picks up role of Community Council and elects five new directors. Jane Fox, screen print consultant, arrives to work with Industry.

Internal: All House and Community Care Workers arrive home from Sydney following Research Council (including Panchayat visit) Tippets and Rob Horne call enroute to Adelaide.

Contradiction: Needing practical options for engagement of idle youth and adults now. (Wk. 6)

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: Kilkivan CYF and foray around first cluster nets good results including go aheads for March.

Internal: House celebrates Australia Day by watching cricket and seeing home team go down to the West Indies; also phoned Rolf Harris for Australia Day message.

Contradiction: Articulating the missional story that will release the necessary yesses. (Wk. 6)

### **SUVA**

#### **RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Severe tidal wave destroys much of Majuro (D-U-D area) including the Majuro House. President Carter declares Majuro a US federal disaster area. Sales at TASC continue to the few customers still in business and increase to Red Cross and US Army who set up three tent cities and feed 10,000 daily.

Internal: Baileys return for Regional Council glad to have a room instead of a tent, and ongoing House structures offer an island of normalcy in a sea of chaos.

Contradiction: Transforming the disaster wave into a creative wave that allows the refinancing of TASC. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP**

External: Savaii Loto, 1974 ITI grad, witnesses to the ITI as training for replication in the Pacific and 10 Salani villagers sign up.

Internal: The fishing boat supplies food for the House in addition to an economic victory for the village.

Contradiction: Quickly capitalizing an interest in the ITI to move six people to decide to staff 3 new area Suva Houses in August. (Wk. 2)

**SAN FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Completed first Reno Nevada Circuit with concentration on Town Meeting follow up.

Internal: Area newsletter mailed. Week II pull together of symposium (all from previous two circuits).

Contradiction: Maintaining a corporate thrust in the midst of complex activities. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP**

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: House welcomes January sojourners Laura Lee from Gettysburg College and visit from Bill and Lottie Felkaer from Salt Lake City with truckload of gifts.

Contradiction: Ensuring large election turnout for Pisenemo Development Authority. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

External: Monthly Guardians luncheon meeting is held at House and plans are made for an "International Night" celebration in February. Initial phoning set up visits with the towns who previously had Town Meetings meets enthusiastic response.

Internal: Ecclesiola stands firm as a stake in our week in the midst of changes: one new self-support job and complete transformation of the kitchen with new paint, wallpaper and contact paper.

Contradiction: Orchestrating practices so that all your time and energy is not spent in preparing to do the task. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP**

Contradiction: Discontinuing management by crisis to allow nitty-gritty tasks to get done as well as long-range planning. (Wk. 4)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Team returns from four day circuit having visited 22 towns which completes visiting of over 80 towns that held Town Meetings several years ago. All reports positive. First neighborhood in Boulder neighborhood TM campaign is ready for core meeting and their brochure goes to typesetter. Task Force prepares to host Area Panchayat trek.

Internal: House shrinks in size as three persons are sent out.

Contradiction: Tackling the practices of all the maneuvers in order to keep momentum going on all fronts. (Wk. 6)

**EDMONTON****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

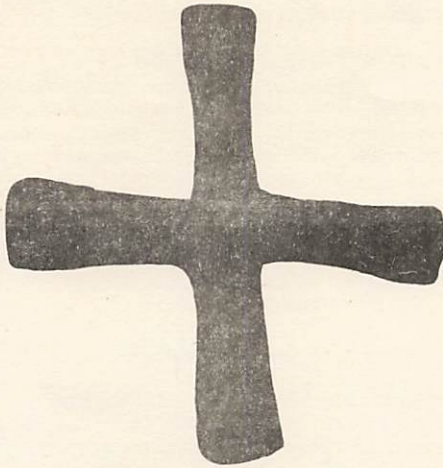
## **GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM**

The rally culminates a month of miracles in 24 Mactan villages — daily preschool (50 to 100 children each), children marching and singing, stake visitation, Village Association meetings, baby weighing, in-kindling, Division and Island meetings and the appearance of the second "Mactan Voice". Even the most hesitant of government agency staff is now an enthusiastic supporter of the Mactan 24!!

Internal: At the height of final preparation for the rally, 100 bluishirts gathered to welcome the Global Panchayat Team and representatives from every region in Hong Kong with a feast of seafood and song, dramatized by a blackout as voices swell to the tune "Sudtonggan".

Contradiction: Having successfully launched 24 projects in January, how do we orchestrate February so that it is the same kind of maneuver, when Lusan and Iloilo loom on the horizon? (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP**

External: Weighing of 602 children, all the 1-6 year olds in all six HDPs, is completed revealing 72% malnourished. Red Cross and Ministry of Social Services and Development respond to request for food and nutrition program. Parents Preschool Association meetings are held in Luman, Valancia, Carmen and Maytuod HDPs to prepare for new preschool launch.

Contradiction: Handling food, transportation and supplies for new preschool launch. (Wk. 7)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

**Internal:** Saturday night Thanksgiving dinner becomes a sendout party for the Castros.

**Contradiction:** Containing the explosions that are happening simultaneously in the Project, Development and the Movement. (Wk. 11)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports the Regional troops finish first week on the turf with checks totalling \$3000 above their bottomline. World Bank has two day site visit at Chicago Nexus. Development Collegium sets whole Nexus spinning on funding/formation relationship. Singapore guardian takes out \$24,000 loan to finance HDTS which he will repay. The breakthrough is in the new understanding that framing CIDA means framing Canada. The key contradiction is development of six month strategies to release the Continental team thrust.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports we host two key representatives from the Research Division of the World Bank, who are here to explore the possibility of working cooperatively on a documentation report on replication. Chicago awakening campaign moves ahead with the securing of representatives from the Black, Latino, and Asian communities on the Advisory Board. Truman College and Edgewater-Uptown Mental Health agree to sponsor a special forum focused on women in Community service. The key breakthrough is the selection of the quarter IV ecclesiola study *The Good Society* by John Friedman. The key contradiction is continuing to take corporate strides forward in many arenas, when we experience ourselves as continually dispersed and always needing to catch one another up.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

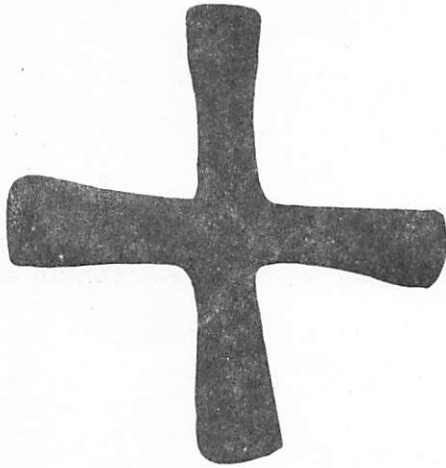
## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: Mid-project transition event catalyzing rapid actuation across the programmes including collection of Rs 400/—for road bricks in Stake 4, permission for 75 bags of cement for stalled Community Center from local government, temple roadbricking restarted, in-kind hand pump installed on Harijan well and pest control and grain storage throughout the village. First visit to Lucknow made to begin work on state frame and tax exemption while unrequested site visit is made by Deputy-Ambassador Burma.

Internal: Reordering Delhi House space and cleaning Delhi office after transition event releasing new staff motivity.

Contradiction: Maintaining the actuation momentum gained by the transition event in the midst of document completion and Global Panchayat visitation. (Wk. 8)

## MADRAS

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: National Khadi Village Industries Board agrees to register Nadlapur Industrial Cooperative for benefits of its training services and guaranteed marketing. Large earthen mural painted on Community Center. Two leaders, one of whom is a woman, are sent out to the HDTI.

Internal: Community center decor is upgraded for the Panchayat visit.

Contradiction: Forming events which build on strong motivation for self-help to enable historical consciousness. (Wk. 9)

## CALCUTTA

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: The movement event with the Global Panchayat which is attended by 15 people other than those in the Order, opens eyes of new and old colleagues alike to the scope and depth of the movement. CYF training builds a new thrust of formation among youth who helped lead a CYF the next day.

Internal: The presence of the Global Panchayat puts us over against the globe and pushes us one step beyond where we thought we could walk.

Contradiction: Creating the clear picture of the end of the year position in each region which catalyzes the area.

## SINGAPORE

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: House hosts development blitz while deploying 6 of the Nexus forces to the zone.

Internal: Potential buyer shows up to look at House which is in severe "morning after" condition and subsequent cleaning blitz.

Contradiction: Insuring total self-support of Nexus after a key strategy falls through. (Wk. 9)

### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HLTS and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP**

External: Development blitz opens up not only possibilities for money but inroads to semi-government agencies. President of Malaysian Chamber of Commerce confirms his willingness to give financial and advisory support. Rubber, Rice and Palmoil Estates "Highlands and Lowlands" gives \$500.

Internal: Methods training of Senior Supervisors of Home Extension Workers, under the Ministry of Agriculture, received enthusiastically with excellent implications for long-range self-support possibilities.

Contradiction: Making sure that transition includes extension. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP**

External: Community inkind delivers 1700 cement blocks and 100 bags of cement, as Nurada brick layers begin immediately to lay the walls of the Community Center. The Secretariat spearheads inkind work and begins Quarter IV training.

Internal: Symbolic life experimentation takes a leap as morning ritual is rewritten and Arabic religious phrases are inserted into the meal and wake-up rituals.

Contradiction: Using the momentum of the Community Center construction to catalyze increasing community responsibility for the Nurada project. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP**

External: The second week of the Bubun Advanced Training School came to an end with 32 full-time volunteers participating in a 24-hour, 4-session Odyssey on the Journey of Those Who Care and this event marks a decision in their own preparation and journey. Regional Guardians attend government meeting and Guardians' event in Jakarta with the Panchayat and produces concrete go-ahead to begin Bubun Cluster Actuation circuits and modules. First cluster module is held in Bubun on cadre formation and preparation begins for first cluster circuit.

Internal: Dick West and Wa'u Famachoi, Rose Casswell and Rob Jennings-Teats are sent out to represent three Regional Houses during the Panchayat visit. Cluster module celebration is creative release with poetry expressing Indonesian depth passion. Massive repairs and new decor begin to create environmental demonstration in the Bubun Training Center.

Contradiction: How to finally get out to the circuit villages to enable active guild building and to catalyze cluster support and action. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP**

External: Camat (local District Chief) arranges boat and supplies for site selection trip along the Sulawesi Coast, symbolizing the government's willingness to take the next steps of expansion to a Bontoa cluster.

Internal: Four volunteer staff (KKN program-university students on field work) sent out after village service sojourn; one testifies how the town meeting campaign taught him the necessity of a strong decision to overcome blocks on the way.

Contradiction: Clarifying staff assignments to synchronize with shifty village structures. (Wk. 9)

**HONG KONG**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: All systems out covering the Continent with development in Japan and the Philippines; documentation in Sudtunggan; LENS pedagogy in Medan and extension maneuvering in Korea.

Internal: Door swings wide as Roxana Harper passes through from Management Band Meeting. Huang Hsing Peng comes to do visa work to U.S. and troops return in time to celebrate the Lunar New Year.

Contradiction: An unconsented structure for creating the programmatic schedule during Quarter III and IV. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP**

External: Shell sends \$2,000 HK for Nam Wai.

Internal: Wednesday and Saturday the Nexus and Nam Wai meet to work on urban probe, LENS, Agency Forums and geo-social analysis.

Contradiction: Building a movement rather than extending an organizational pattern. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP**

External: Extension preparation accelerates after week-long visit from four students on vacation. They assist village youth and auxiliary in the creation of eight new visible signs and celebrate with singing and games at all-night beach party. The Community Center completion program picks up a large inkind donation of paint and cement, while the work stops temporarily for the New Year Celebrations.

Contradiction: Holding course toward the open sea while everyone else wants to go ashore for the New Year. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Seventy business people attend Guardians luncheon at Manila Peninsula Hotel. Japanese Chamber of Commerce gives permission for Japanese companies to contribute to I.C.A. in Manila. U.S. Ambassador announces visit to Sudtunggan in February. Copra jackhammer is inkind for Mactan rock industry.

Internal: Events surrounding Panchayat visit include celebration with Hong Kong and Taiwan representatives along with local parish colleagues and board members.

Contradiction: Designing the delivery system which allows the present bubblings of new activity to significantly participate in the future. (Wk. 7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: ICA auditor in Taipei releases favorable report on 1979 audit of ICA Taiwan books for Taipei office and Hai Ou HDP. Local trading company loans U.S. \$2,800 on interest-free basis toward completion of new Community Center facility in Hai Ou Project.

Internal: Five-month task chart for Taiwan built for time through spring quarter to July. Centrum Hong Kong Operations staff accompany us on visit to Hai Ou.

Contradiction: Bringing the global agenda of human development to bear in Hai Ou in the midst of existing-and often unknown-agendas of local, regional and national political realities. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUBTONGGAN HDP**

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

Internal: Saturday fast day with reflective conversations and individual decisions on what fasting is over and about, deepens the power of major planning weekend focused on two-year practical vision for the region.

Contradiction: Moving on momentum built from Central and Jackson set-up and film showing to release \$24,000. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Eight town meetings in Shreveport PDD with a new cluster beginning to emerge and positive reception from Bossier City and Gibsland for consultation evidence continued convergence. LENS lab opens way for House and colleagues to renew marketing efforts.

Internal: New decor of collegium room delights road troops as all return home to participate in New Orleans' preparation for Mardi Gras with House full of guests.

Contradiction: Pushing the support system up to the level of our missional engagement. (Wk. 9)

**CHICAGO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: This was a week of expecting the unexpected through the beginning of the Ivy City HDTS, \$7,000 in program money and a LENS in Nigeria for 3M with three new facilitators.

Internal: A week of celebrating the dynamics of the secular religious in the form of the Fast and Mardi Gras culminating in the sustenance of House Church and little green envelopes.

Contradiction: Unprecedented momentum in the presence of untold stories about the strategic keystone to the 2 million awakening phasing and the consensus required. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Conquering the self-support arena. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Clarifying the roles, responsibilities and functions of an Area House. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: Visit with Pittsburgh's Deputy Superintendent of Schools, who is excited about CYF, leads to a February 25th CYF presentation to the Instructional Council. In kind win of 50 lbs. of turkey, 60 lbs. of fish, 10 lbs. of cheese and 3 lbs of potato chips for Ivy City HDTs is delivered for opening feast.

Internal: House celebrates win of having development take Pittsburgh seriously by escorting Troxel to Mt. Washington, Station Square and Gallagher's Pub.

Contradiction: Standing in the tension of the state, regional and urban demands. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Urban research heats up with visitation and initial framing. Jan Ulangca is regional presence in Rochester while Ruth Dyhr is on areal assignment to Hartford.

Internal: Champagne and cake birthday breakfast for Stan Crow prepared by youth and emerging generation.

Contradiction: Shifting HDTs recruitment from mail and phone to targeted visitation for eye-to-eye block removal. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

Internal: House goes to local tavern to celebrate the fear and fascination of Mike's send out to Nigeria.

Contradiction: Continuing focused thrust in the midst of radical troop and space reconfigurations. (Wk. 8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP**

External: Town Supervisor visits core meeting to share not only dreams but specific plans for youth and elders recreational land and facility and is eager to work with Charlottesville HDP to bring youth and elder plans to fruition.

Internal: Evening with the Institute is great collegial and informative event for metro and House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in framing, core training, Charlottesville Valley Firewood options, and other keystone proposals in the absence of clear death ground. (Wk. 9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: House gets green light to begin new phase of leadership training in signal community. New contacts opened through film showings at Rhode Island church, Boston College Sociology class, Salvation Army, Boys' Club and Evening at the Institute.

Internal: House rehearses five presuppositions of Community Reformulation and participates in Hartford House moving in only snowstorm of the winter.

Contradiction: Initiating metro circuits and sustaining the urgency in midst of long-range tasks and day-to-day activities. (Wk. 9)

External: Ecclesiola night initiated with 26 guests. Cano Negro CYF with 32 participants launches youth program. Eleven institutions contacted on foray into Colombia.

Internal: Sojourner, Cruz Alberto Itriago, from Cano Negro is welcomed with informal party.

Contradiction: Backing into victories and not being prepared for the possibilities. (Wk. 8)

## BUENOS AIRES

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Seven agricultural engineers, candidates for resident agronomist, visit Sol de Septiembre for an orientation to the project and a description of the position, and communities surrounding Sol are explored for good community forum sites for March.

Internal: Seventy-five people of Sol accompany Joaquina Rodriguez to the airport as she becomes Sol de Septiembre's first ambassador in service to the world's communities.

Contradiction: Intensifying focus on external task with the same intensity as that given to the internal life planning and brooding. (Wk. 9)

## RIO DE JANEIRO

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: ITT site visit happens on the same day as baby weighing, the first day of training for launching the new banana fiber basketry industry, and the receipt of the first signed contract for the guinea pig industry. EMATER (government agriculture extension) and project joint research into small animal industries takes Rogerio and auxiliary into Rio returning with dog vaccines, new industry possibilities for pigeons and frogs, and a call on the EMATER Regional Director relative to their being a town meeting rider. Dorca leads the Friday community meeting, where each of the 25 gardens received first-year awards for beauty and quality. Local fazenda owners agree to meet to discuss donation of land for the Community Center.

Internal: Weekend PSU produces one-page Portugese town meeting workbook and the state of Rio is gridded to the polis level with an eye toward the May campaign.

Contradiction: Keeping the programs swirling while participating in the wild celebration of four days of carnival. (Wk. 9)

## HAVANA

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Loan Board representatives begin loan education program in stake meetings. Preschool floor concrete is poured in half of building and a young man from the village joins the preschool staff which now numbers four. Two electric sanders are purchased for woodwork industry, as work is resumed on construction of industry shed. Two Community Forums held and one set up in St. Thomas parish.

Internal: Larry Ward is sent out to join Continental Development Task Force in Caracas.

Contradiction: Allowing time for adequate planning in the midst of intensified doing. (Wk. 9)

## MEXICO CITY

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP**

External: The whole department (State of El Progreso) is done as eight Town Meetings are held, each averaging 25-50 in attendance. Governor is pleased and door is opened again to continue campaign across the country. Twenty-five villagers help lay the water distribution system in the village.

Internal: The two-prong thrust of week provides opportunity for involving village residents in TM orchestration.

Contradiction: Maintaining flexibility in a continually fluctuating situation. (Wk. 9)

## LIMA

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP**

External: Visit by the Ministry of Education National Planning Institute and UNDP offers the village a new preschool complete with furniture, teachers and salaries. Friday night Secretariat meeting reveals strength of village leaders.

Internal: Saturday night Thanksgiving dinner becomes a sendout party for the Castros.

Contradiction: Containing the explosions that are happening simultaneously in the Project, Development and the Movement. (Wk. 11)

## GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Japanese companies in Tokyo are ready to support Philippine projects; Molson Co. of Canada gives \$10,000; Monsanto - \$1,000; inkind printing of poster for March Grassroots mailing. Breakthroughs and trends in increasing site visits to Mactan provide solid relationship between projects and business community. Professional expertise used in "deferred giving" seminar in Chicago and grassroots mailing by Kansas City House. Role of Interface between CSA and Ivy City is seen in several CAS visits to the HDTs. Creating the undergirding structures in regions which will enable regular development while maintaining tension of bringing in immediate money and acting on opportunities.

## GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports two men from the World Bank, Research Center, spent two days in Chicago in consideration of a joint research project next year. Ecclesiola Manual for Quarter IV basically ready for press. Three village leaders for district have said yes to a unique turn in HDTs in Maliwada. The breakthrough is that Bombay reports that plans are underway for a Research Colloquy March 23 to April, the brochure for same is out and facilities have been located which will be the government guest house in Nagpur. India is also doing a new construct called Women's Advancement Modules. The key contradiction is mounting program demands are stretching troop and financial resources to the limits as July 1980 seems to be approaching rapidly.

## GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports impact intensification with LENS pedagogy in Singapore and GWF marketing in Atlanta, Richgrove, Pisinemo and Indiahoma. Keystone Extension Workshops completed marking two thirds of the journey. The breakthroughs have to do with blitz configurations to get substantive tasks done quickly. The key contradiction lies in the arena of presupposing strategies that block comprehensive strategy breakloose.

## GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that resolves initiated as computer is on site and health systems given go ahead in Hong Kong and first phase of computer procedures manual is complete and health manual launched in Chicago. H.K. \$50,000 order funds long term certificate deposited at 15.25% interest. Chicago 1979 audit schedules (100) are nearly 40% complete and media researches presses. The key contradiction is creating and articulating the "management is front lines" story while maintaining daily effective systems.
