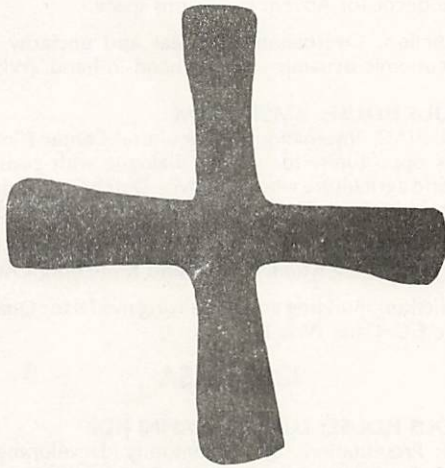

WEEK ONE

DECEMBER 30 - JANUARY 6



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: The first week of metro circuits nets two "sets" set, one each in the London and Oxford metros.

Internal: Five Indonesians pay a visit, as well as two new Island families.

Contradiction: Finding a way to celebrate the chaos of overwhelming issues and accelerating external demands. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional colleague, David Fleming, says, "yes" to ICA speaking engagement. Sister Mary Agnes, a Glasgow Sister, calls to arrange Youth Forum meeting.

Internal: House budget rapidly improves with new job and other incomes.

Contradiction: Pushing the self-support victory to all the other arenas. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH

External: Management Board of Tai'rgwaith Community Society Ltd., names firm to pour foundation for community building and takes assignments to reconfirm inkind commitments for materials. A great week of Development visits uncovers a multinational corporation interested in sponsoring Town Meetings in Cornwall.

Internal: Roger Williams is sent out to London to fill immediate job opening.

Contradiction: Finding capital funds to back management board's decision in time of tightening economic situation. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE MANCHESTER

External: Two Community Youth Forums are held. One produces volunteers for training to lead the next three events.

Internal: Ian Grow remains in Manchester to help lead CYFs after great youth training in Week II.

When exhortation has done its work and the looting is over, when the heel of the oppressor has vanished from the land, a throne shall be set up in mutual trust in David's tent, and on it there shall sit a true judge, one who seeks justice and is swift to do right.

Contradiction: Using troops effectively to cover all fronts to be well set up for beginning with a bang next quarter. (Wk. 12)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Father Garcia S.J. translates Brussels registration document and Father Bartolome de Vincens O.P. introduces us to top lawyer in Madrid to begin proceedings toward ICA registration as foundation in Spain. John Bazill finishes first draft translation of Community Forum materials in Spanish.

Internal: Greetings of season sent in Spanish to 50 new colleagues. Two months of housing inkinded for January and February.

Contradiction: Getting one month's work on Community Forum materials done in Spanish before Quarter III begins. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Entire House attends Continental Council in Brussels and leaves refreshed by The Voyage, the celebration of The Advent of the 80s and the continental awakening maneuvers.

Internal: Entire House home at one time celebrates with Ecclesiola, study of Jules Verne and two very small inkind ducks.

Contradiction: Venturing into the next steps with sets without a break open image. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Continental Council comes off as a great event, with innovative methods keyed around a Thursday Area Priors Flagstaff and 45 minute Voyage exercises at mealtimes, and leaves, as a residue, an emerging image of expanded Centrum roles and tasks for the future.

Internal: Council practices, from initial stages to preparation blitzes to in-kind coups to kitchen operations to materials production, provide an astonishing display of nonchalant competence which amazes us before, during, and after the event.

Contradiction: Devising images, procedures, and designs which allow House to effectively move into the multitude of immediate and long-term models and events required by the missional claims placed by the council. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Urban set in Gent guest worker neighborhood starts with big local set-up meeting.

Internal: Open House catalyzes new House decor.

Contradiction: Discerning way to link Gent set to regional formulation. (Wk. 6)

ROME

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME—TERMINE HDP

External: Two Cooperative meetings the same day with visit from government extension agency focus on marketing, quality control and loan possibilities into dramatic grounding occasions decisions to hire one more full-time member symbolizes decision to move ahead into next phase. Religious Order decides to be a network for TMs in Naples Region.

Internal: Patricia Doyle sent out to London after impacting us with her engagement.

Contradiction: Securing immediate work for Cooperative in midst of comprehensive marketing task. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP

External: A full week symbolized by street lights on again in the village now that the generator is repaired.

Internal: Jack Gilles and Bill Parker come for a week of LENS set-up and report on LENS and projects across Africa.

Contradiction: Symbolizing momentum in the village. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Visit with French Ministry of Cooperation opens new avenues for their support in Francophone Africa. Guardian, Gerald Nani, does week of framing calls and gets out his calendar to look at possibility of going on West Africa framing trip in January.

Internal: Fast is followed by very early morning feast, which enables new self-consciousness of the dynamics of the feast.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of one thrust when in two locations. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Evening at the Institute is held at House with 17 colleagues and new acquaintances in attendance to hear report on Kenya with slides given by Johannes Bruckner and Harry Janssen. Colleagues help with enablement and tour House during show. Two registrations for Christmas trek follow within two days.

Internal: House discovers the power of the facility in telling the movement story.

Contradiction: Taking time to pull together and train self-conscious movement so that limited resources expand to fill the program opportunities available. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Christmas Market takes place as key community event generating large community participation. Thirteen thousand people attend the market with 5600 DM income for Project. Full day street program with Turkish and German bands and artistic groups entertain whole community.

Internal: Residence permit for Mike Deloughery is promised and fine decor for Advent transforms space.

Contradiction: Overcoming the fear and unclarity of the socio-economic dynamic working hand-in-hand. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: (IAC) International Agricultural Center Film Show provides opportunity for serious dialogue with consultants to third world agriculture who also advise Dutch Government on third world projects. First Area Council in Netherlands.

Internal: Margreet Farid returns from three weeks visiting in Germany, touching Munich, Koln and Kreuzberg Ost.

Contradiction: Building and actualizing model for Quarter III Exquisite E.G. Care. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Presentation on Community Development to Scandinavians and Canadians at Presidents' Citizenship College followed by a Kapini site visit, and visits from Anglo-American, Barclays Bank, TIMES of Zambia and CUSA Co-op Loan Association are sharp reminders of Kapini's visibility to the nation. Highlights from the Guilds include Under Five Clinic with 146 vaccinated, 24 pregnant women seen and a count of 17 babies born last month; the re-opening of the General Store; five varieties of vegetables planted at the Demonstration Farm; and workdays at the primary and pre-school.

Internal: House sends out two Catholic aspirants following their six-month sojourn and welcomes Mr. Deth and Eusebion Muloshi's fiancée, Felisters and grand news of a February wedding.

Contradiction: Expanding the Project vision despite immediate farming demands and struggle with economic productivity units. (Wk. 12)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The seeds are in the ground of the high desert land behind Bayad, possibly for the first time in the history of the earth. Meanwhile, 51 galabayas, 35 scarves, 14 hats, and entire inventory of marmalade is sold in Germany and Maadi, an international suburb of Cairo.

Internal: Pooles are sent to Bi-Continental Council in Brussels.

Contradiction: Finding ways for village to propel itself toward the transition in June. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Great week of events with HDTI graduation of 33 who have decided to be the "New Village Movement". Quarter II maneuvers are built by the largest Area Nairobi Council. Three new houses commissioned, "old" houses and support system troupes reaffirm their decision to do the mission. New Villages of Kyuluni, Kilisa and Ulutya ready for consults in January. Operations, old hands and new, prepares to do awakening events: 45 Village Meetings and eight location assemblies, the remaining three divisions in Machakos.

Internal: Dr. Deth stops over for two days on way from Kapini to El Bayad. Staff celebrates 16 years of Kenya's independence by participating in Jamhuri Day event with the nation and a picnic lunch. House invited to Firestone Christmas party at Nairobi Hilton and enjoys drinks and meat.

Contradiction: Imaginally and practically keeping all fronts winning when the fronts have doubled. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hagega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Representatives from each division meet with Global Methods School to plan Actuation Module for closing week of GMS when district team counterparts come to Maliwada to build maneuvers for each district till end of quarter. Women in GMS meet with area to plan women's advancement actuation module.

Internal: Participating in *Ancient of Days* conversation during Actuation module in GMS given new myths to stand before in ongoing process of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: How to publish new song book before Council. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Nexus participated in compiling the EEC report for the second draw of money. At the same time the report on the renewal of 35CCA and a fresh application for 80GGA (income tax forms) was also completed. One of the significant happenings for Bombay Nexus has been a shramdan on Sankli Street, with Sankli St. residents joining us. "Sankli Street is the Pride of Byculla".

Internal: Nexus is continually experiencing the "Two Wayside" dynamic with people coming in and going out. Chanda Age, Terry Fernandez and Prabhakar Gurav return from the Global Methods School in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Dealing with crucial immediacies while keeping the long range task in mind. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: White washing temple catalyzes 200 strong village meeting. Successful health camp and first 'spontaneous' village workday.

Internal: Inkind blankets, medicine and clothes receives winter colds and flu and releases all to new engagement.

Contradiction: Ensuring project momentum is maintained through end of quarter discontinuity and Continental Council. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Foundations for 30 new houses completed. The house design made by the villagers themselves is adapted by

neighboring towns. A ten point plan for completion of the project is submitted on invitation of the district collector.

Internal: Auxiliary gets its teeth into intensive Gram Sabha pedagogy.

Contradiction: Decision making and training structures become static. (Wk. 1)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Development team breaks loose with Rs. 10,000 in hand and Rs. 19,000 committed by years end.

Internal: The *Surprising the Tiger* awakening campaign concludes with a great celebration and feast. The tiger is named *Matahari Vijay* (Malay & Hindi) for *Light of Day Victory*.

Contradiction: Deciding which programmatic moves lead us to greater authorization, funding and clarity on site selection without narrowing options prematurely. (Wk. 1)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Support of Bubun HDTs Cluster Consults, Sungai Lui Community Assembly and Area Sydney OE Financing provide occasions for great creativity and expenditure.

Internal: Fasting day provides occasion for reflection on points of significant engagement of year.

Contradiction: Covering all January Councils, Band Meetings and program events with personnel, models and financial underpinning is a real challenge. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Norghani, Director General of Socio-Economic Research Unit of Malaysia is guest speaker at Sungai Lui Village Assembly. He gives a 45 minute talk on what it would mean for Sungai Lui to be the Number One Demonstration Project for all of Malaysia. "This is your project and you've done the work to make it what it is and it's your responsibility to continue working together on behalf of all Malaysia." Managing Director of Barclays Bank, John Carruthers, is also a guest.

Internal: House visited by possible new sojourner Agatha who helps in transcribing Norghanis talk at Assembly.

Contradiction: How to take the village resolve to carry on project and turn that into concrete structures within next three months before ICAs departure. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Key leader of Ministry of Home Affairs helps ICA to strengthen national and provincial frames. Nurada kicks off construction of community center by 50 person Gotong Royong workday. Land deal is negotiated by villagers and government.

Internal: A. Paul's baby girl arrives three weeks early, just 12 hours after Antony arrives on the scene from Bubun.

Contradiction: Realizing government decision in December to enable extension in September, 1980, while at the same time intensifying the demonstration so that every local government office will beg for extension. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Fourth DOOP, the Human Development Module, with focus on living environment brings out master plan design for Bubun. Ur image impact is great with releasing celebration Saturday night with food, singing, and dancing from the six urs. Provincial head of rural development speaks to HDTs participants about Governor's seven prognoses for village development and challenges Bubun to leap rest of way from undeveloped to developed village.

Internal: Kaz study in HDTs gives images to the "cry" struggle to articulate in familiar Islamic terms.

Contradiction: Creating the mythology to sustain the movement which is forming before our eyes. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP

External: Total of 41 TMs in eight day campaign finished in spite of rain and floods. Women's classes and cooking demonstrations continue with Kabupaten and Kecamatan (County and District) women leadership. LENS marketing with Kadin (Chamber of Commerce) yields 4 companies registered out of 12 visited Provincial Parliament chairman writes to Governor requesting the Provincial Government to ask ICA to locate the HDTs in South Sulawesi in the next year and requests LENS for government officials and volunteer groups in South Sulawesi.

Internal: Creating a global fast montage on Area contradiction explodes images of the staff relative to Area relationships and provides a new depth to fasting and feasting on behalf of the world.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate discipline and structure in the midst of intensive campaign as house approaches end of the quarter. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Consult task force is sent to Sudtonggan for set-up. House is dispersed in mission across the zone with four Development treks in three nations and closing week of Sudtonggan HDTs.

Internal: Advent reflection and *Ice Age Man* study powerfully enable brooding on role and nature of the Religious in society.

Contradiction: Clarifying time design for study and reflection necessary for weeks of preceding SEAPAC Council. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Development trek brings \$1500 (H.K.).

Internal: Nexus and House spend Saturday making decor for Seapac Council and celebrates with feast at Ho Chun Restaurant.

Contradiction: Developing comprehensive picture of new Regional Strategy. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAUHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Global Film showing provides much needed context for growing group of Guardians and opens new doors for TWC. Community journey is enhanced with house-to-house visits with Hai Ou history and three villagers commit themselves to forthcoming SEAPAC tour at the regular community meeting. Construction on the Activity Centre continues with completion of pillars on second floor.

Internal: House sends out Linda Yang to Taipei to help with development and celebrates a great week with an adventurous trek to the mountains.

Contradiction: Finding the Chinese *Those Who Care* to release the next quarter's victories. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: It is a week of inkind victories with Toyota Jeepney for Mactan delivered to boat and with Rancie cloth for teachers' uniforms for 20 new Mactan preschools. There are also breakthroughs with companies including two inquiries about doing projects cooperatively around company plantations, endorsement by Japanese Chamber of Commerce and LENS seminar set for January with San Miguel Corporation.

Internal: House is visited by two Oyubari residents returning from Sudtonggan trip.

Contradiction: Focusing all programs into one national thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: China Television Corporation assists us for second time by transposing global film from 16 mm movie to video tape. Fifteen Chinese companies of Top 500 industrials in Taiwan visited in 3 days, half the visits done in Chinese.

Internal: Hong Kong development staff arrive for one week trek. Christmas decor enlivens House.

Contradiction: Getting our plans for the winter and spring quarters into tactics we can move on. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Four-ring circus initiates girding Mactan Coral Reef with 24 carat gold crown as four 15-man teams march across rock fields and fish ponds in the rain to launch first four of 24 villages. By the time of second set of four consults on Thursday and Friday, City Officials eagerly signing up to attend closing feasts and island grapevine is overflowing. Average attendance at the eight so far is 200, with Iron Man T-Shirt sales outdoing all expectations. Receive long-awaited yellow Tamaraw Toyota truck in time to be logistics support. In midst of this circus, Development blitz shows Global Film to "Cebu 400" groups.

Internal: Receive Nick Denner, Guardian from the U.S., to participate in Mactan consults.

Contradiction: Combining on-site methods training and 100 percent 'eventfulness' in the consults that will ensure 24 activated Early Learning Nutrition Centers on Mactan on January 2, 1980. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Eight thousand more cacao seeds are delivered to Luman HDP, Carmen HDP, LaPaz HDP, and Magtued HDP. Irrigation proposal for Luman HDP is approved for funding by regional government. Farm Systems Development Corporation, the Davao City Mayor, and Regional Director of MLDCG endorse proposal to expand Langub HDP water system and send it to Manila.

Internal: New water tank is installed inside the kitchen and staff training collegiums on JWM talks, SEAPAC grid, and global news continue to undergird the House.

Contradiction: Designing an operational system to continue the acceleration of programs while dealing with very limited funds. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: A one day consultation (3/5 of a LENS Seminar) led by one ICA staff and one Guardian is held for 20 managers of the Dentsu PR Center, Ltd., a subsidiary of the world's largest advertising company, and yields a fine new plan for company training, a substantial fee (\$750) and the probability of further work with the company.

Internal: Christmas party scores big with 35 in attendance coming from six nations; "Silent Night" is sung in four languages simultaneously.

Contradiction: Keeping a steady gentle pressure behind all 23 major maneuvers and initiatives that are currently in the works so that one die due to a lack of attention. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Experimental series of declaration missions is completed with twelfth in Sang Yang Ri.

Internal: Passage film impacts House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythm while dancing so close to the edge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Visit with key bank colleague lays track for Quarter III development and housing issues. Clergy visits produce several hundred dollars and February PLC

Internal: Discovery of an insightful book on Korean customs stimulates move toward common regional study. Fine Ecclesiola celebration reminds us of the enduring value of that structure.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in go position for quarter III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Community has work week, to bring down feed from the mountain for common cattle barn, to winterize piggery, to gather the rice straw for bedding and to fix the water pipes.

Internal: Temporary wall creates house space out of community hall giving the staff a toasty warm meeting area.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly to keep up with the immediate needs, without having eyes on a long-range goal. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House continues development and raises \$250. Nagasaki's 18 impact events are confirmed. A volunteer continues setting up Development calls. January 12 receives boost with 75 people at Year End Party at ICA.

Internal: After Year End Party, volunteers stay over, Karikosis came to visit, and 13 sit down for breakfast the next day.

Contradiction: Sustaining the momentum during the Holiday season and planning for the next six months. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Ishikawa prefecture proves to us that persistent patience pays off as they schedule a Town Meeting for January. Stronghold planning for Nara prefecture continues as last year's coordinator takes circuit team on a three hour tour of Yoshino and schedules a presentation for social education directors from every community in the prefecture.

Internal: Sushila Joshi returns to Osaka for a two day visit and life in the House is even busier than usual with people coming to see Sushila during her stay.

Contradiction: Keeping your eyes on the landmarks that enables you to plough the straight furrows. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Eleven English speaking society students from Hokkaido Agriculture University attend evening at the Institute. Economic research continues with Ski Association. TM authorization in neighboring village. Work continues on three Christmas parties for this weekend.

Internal: Butcher hobbles to first place in Oyubari basketball tournament.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to engage all segments of the whole community both in and outside of Oyubari. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Second great assault takes place on the new Australian myth through preparing, procuring, printing, and stuffing of 700 ICA Newsletters, including grassroots development appeal to 283. Names 12 tracking towns for corporate Research project.

Internal: Great House Christmas Party includes corporate feast (everyone makes their own favorite dish). Christmas carols, gift exchange and combined musical talent heretofore unheard.

Contradiction: Becoming entangled from the claims of Quarter II in order to get the jump on Quarter. III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Exciting Open House event is held Wednesday night with 15 guests including RS-1 grads, long-time colleagues, and new friends. Six month maneuvers are prepared, printed, and placed on a timeline. Key Development appointments are set for next weeks Development thrust.

Internal: The last piece of decor is hung in the lounge just in time for the Open House.

Contradiction: Discerning and stating the one thing we are out to do in the midst of all the tactics and maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: RS-1 scheduled and site selected as recruitment begins.

Internal: Spirit care symbolized by decorating the Christmas tree and by collegial calls from other houses.

Contradiction: Being disengaged while still remaining in house during discontinuity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Regional Council of 14 grabs ahold of the challenges facing the Murrin Bridge economic development and Portland demonstration community vision with maturity and commitment. Guardian brings his \$205 cheque for Murrin Bridge table and takes professional photos of the products to sell to his neighbors and friends.

Internal: Baker family is sent out to Advent discontinuity before Joanne's baby arrives.

Contradiction: Utilizing discontinuity to maximize missional effectiveness. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Joan King stays in Sydney to help with marketing for the Industry, funeral of Mrs. Jean Biggs, community elder, involves most community members. Youth excited by holiday activity program and new ping-pong table they earned for themselves.

Internal: Sr. Anne Marie visits from Convent School to express Christmas greetings and desire to work more closely with community next year.

Contradiction: Creating symbolic events which indicate local responsibility. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Christmas mailing prepared for grassroots year end contributions. Calendars for next quarter enliven office space. House assumes responsibility for Summer Youth Program. CYF set-up for January.

Internal: House celebrates birthday and arrival of Christmas tree. Garden planted with vegetables galore.

Contradiction: Operating out of a winning model now that year's plan has new values and is out of focus. (Wk. 1)

SUVA

ICA and TASC staff become the supply liaison and hold three orientation sessions for the 30 American Red Cross volunteers and staff flown in. Sales at TASC continue to the few customers still in business and increase to Red Cross and US Army who set up three tent cities and feed 10,000 daily.

Internal: Baileys return for Regional Council glad to have a room instead of a tent, and ongoing House structures offer an island of normalcy in a sea of chaos.

Contradiction: Transforming the disaster wave into a creative wave that allows the refinancing of TASC. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Shadows and stake people are interested in beautification. They help work on seaside park, which has a great impact to the children.

Internal: House's Halloween celebration has exciting mysterious impact in the village as children play masked games and get a good scare at haunted fun house.

Contradiction: Finding the key to go beyond handout mentality of Development. (Wk. 9)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: US Fish and Wildlife service is the highlight of the week with a Special Issues Forum set up in virgin territory, a \$6000 check for October expenses and LENS program, and a great workshop which convinces the staff to trust the method. Ernie Leonard from US F & W goes to Continental Council along with regional colleagues, Roberta Beebe and David St. John.

Internal: The week begins with Mark Rebstock's 12th birthday and ends with a self-support house cleaning and painting maneuver employing half the house in Sacramento while the roaches get bombed in the kitchen.

Contradiction: Getting ready for the 80's when our head is still in the 70's. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: Fernando Campos arrives from Guatemala and his welcome is aided by four colleagues in Richgrove who speak to him in Spanish.

Contradiction: Building more adequate structures to maintain a broad base of community engagement and support. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Swelling spirit of community in Cusick becomes visible during week of Christmas decoration of private homes plus 18 foot community Christmas tree and giant lighted cross on water tower. Week is climaxed by gala potluck celebration of the 75th edition of the community newsletter.

Internal: House sends out the Dick Losh family and Marie Sharp to Continental Council in Chicago.

Contradiction: Continuing nuts and bolts of in-kind, files, Community Service Center construction, and ongoing programs in midst of Christmas celebrations, Continental Council updating, and quarter planning. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: House centers last newsletter of the year on global events from the GOR bringing surprise and delight to those preparing it for mailing.

Internal: Youth cluster and friends celebrate the end of 1979 with in-kind pizza and 16 free tickets to first run showing of *Star Trek*.

Contradiction: Gearing up for another week of Development and no messiahs in sight. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Church network in San Bernardino metro is opened with two film showings. Tulare Demonstration Community Cluster is launched with day long strategies planning meeting attended by 50 people from six communities. House participates in week LENS training in San Francisco.

Internal: Fantastic Week II economic, political and cultural odyssey in Mexico includes total House and regional colleagues in three carfuls.

Contradiction: Turning exploding openings into concrete advantages for a year long strategy. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: LENS follow-up calls and calls to towns of Arizona relative to documentation bring forth towns already to move and possibility of six more LENSes in Arizona.

Internal: Trimming tree, Ecclesiola, and House Church are attended weightily by guardians including Travis Thompson from Albuquerque.

Contradiction: Creating the story that gives cohesion to the vision and focus to strategy so that we choose right choices on behalf of the globe. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: Organizational meeting for Pisinemo Development Authority results in charter revisions and a slate of 26 nominees for ten-member board.

Internal: Christmas Eve celebrated with oriental dinner and opening of gifts.

Contradiction: Designing transitional structures for month of January with myriad of special events and four sojourners. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Community Forum is held on Rocky Boy (Chippawa-Cree) reservation with 53 in attendance for an all day meeting in the gymnasium. High school class attends and sets date for CYF in January.

Internal: Fantastic House Church welcomes back Philbrooks from Continental Council and celebrates Rob and Catherine Bartlett's first anniversary.

Contradiction: Allowing the discontinuity of this season to be creative in its impact when it seems everything has been discontinuous all quarter in the midst of complex self-support and circuit schedules. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cannon Ball expansion takes off again as Kenel TM excites local residents who discuss which two from their district should attend the HDTs. Industry leaps forward as it receives \$5800 order from one buyer.

Internal: House steps out for evening on the town before ending with 2 a.m. breakfast before the long ride home.

Contradiction: Breaking through the limited strategic plans for expansion which restrict Project movement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Development victory nets \$10,600 in hand with more committed by end of year. Rocky Mountain High Maneuver

(revisiting all of Colorado's towns who held TMs) continues with excellent responses and several requests for future workshops.

Internal: Ecclesiola creates Regional symbol for the 80s and plans New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Finishing the wrapping of regional Christmas gifts in time to place under tree for victory celebration. (Wk. 13)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Community Forum Breton and five other events see 75 people participate in CFC dynamic which is good news for the Alberta 75 Campaign.

Internal: Ecclesiola is moved to Saturday night to catch more than one at home.

Contradiction: Focusing the invitation at the point where people have their passion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Two great Community Forums are held in Huntingdon and Jubilee on the same night as two coffee break demonstration forums involving six colleagues and 57 CFC participants and netting \$236.

Internal: Ecclesiola held with only the four House members strikes a balance with the heavy colleague participation of the last one and a half months.

Contradiction: Continuing to have great victories even through the Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Two women pick up crafts coop responsibility while Eartha is at HDTS.

Internal: Martha's first full week of permeation yield salary and \$50 in tips.

Contradiction: Achieving critical victories in midst of radical dispersion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Saskatoon House participates in signal Continental Council which is the most intensive, most destinal, and the most local-man-participating-in experienced in a long while.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Twenty-nine folks from four of the six regions of Area Houston participate in the Voyage. Computer prints 825 Regional newsletter labels. Teams explore six urban demonstration community prospects selected by Chamber of Commerce. Trull Foundation says "yes" to \$5K for Town Meeting.

Internal: Thirty-two feast on 37 pounds of turkey, 11 pies and more for Thanksgiving dinner.

Contradiction: Naming the victory that history needs from the Houston Region before January 1 in the face of unclarity about how to break loose a forum schedule while society's mindset turns more and more toward Christmas and the holidays. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Mayor and ICDC president attend Continental Council in Chicago. New welcome sign is cut and painting begins. Grocery store package to FHA is submitted after local citizen makes \$3000 available. Fifty apply for energy assistance at the community center. Christmas edition of Voice is mailed. VISTA volunteers hold Christmas party. ICDC holds two and a half hour meeting making many decisions with 20 items on the agenda.

Internal: House sends families out for Christmas discontinuity.

Contradiction: Maintaining motivity and momentum during Christmas /New Year discontinuous time. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Town Meeting in Meadowood Acres, the first demonstration community, is a great event with 70 present and bilingual leadership by Asherton residents and the first proposed event scheduled before Christmas.

Internal: Phase I control unexpected flood when the water pipe breaks while all adults are out of town.

Contradiction: Walking the tightrope of creating broadened community frame. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Town Meeting held in Fayetteville, Arkansas is set up by colleague David Beal, who is now attending HDTS in Chicago.

Internal: Luigi Persichetti attends HDTS for Economic Cycle and Jill Rodda joins HDTS for final three weeks.

Contradiction: Using the holiday season as an advantage in eliciting bureaucratic and colleague engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Development phone blitz and New Year's Eve celebration planning completed in midst of sorting responses to Regional Newsletter mailing.

Internal: Homecoming from discontinuity highlighted by hosting guests: Masayo and Yoshi Koshiyama, Ray and Bernhard Knutsen.

Contradiction: Transforming 19th century office space into 21st century space craft. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Cluster assembly plans are firmed up as eight towns respond and sign up to participate. Office of Energy strategy is built for the 80's and work begins with transition teams from new Governor elect, William Winter's, office.

Internal: House has a week of celebrations as colleague comes to dinner and Christmas tree and decor go up.

Contradiction: Creating necessary models and momentum that will kick House into 1980 in the midst of time demands and limits of Council, Christmas discontinuity, and courting new government administration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Ten local workshop leaders emerge from three training events to lead and back-up great 90 person CYF in black community. Event is covered by newspaper and TV network. New leaders are eager to join road team in leading CYFs elsewhere.

Internal: Colleague families move into the house on alternate nights releasing all adults to state maneuvers.

Contradiction: Appropriating within selves to the point of practical actuation that to win in the State Campaign demands winning in Development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Evening at the Institute in holiday season renews relationship with old and acquaints new colleague.

Internal: Celebration of Advent brings refreshing new hope to the grind of proposal rewriting after Week II is spent preparing the new draft for TM saturation in Arkansas.

Contradiction: Waiting for the State to inform House of the next move. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Seventy-five sophomores from Fulton H.S. Gifted Minorities program in Knoxville attend CYF which is broadcast on TV news program that evening. Key city-wide Atlanta GWF includes Dorothy Cotton (Region IV Action Director). Candler-Glenwood leadership training ends with evaluation and plans for weekly guild meetings for winter and spring quarters.

Internal: Ann Loy arrives from Knoxville to participate in Atlanta GWF.

Contradiction: Getting nod from key local frame for second phase of urban strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community moves in all Guild arenas as Town Council says "yes" to HUD Rural Initiations program, visit to E.L.C. Certification Office. Twelve youth at Guild meeting and one house member assists Miami House in Tallahassee Metro Donor Circuits and raises \$5018 which is two and a half times the bottom line.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with everyone cooking one dish creates corporate celebration in midst of having five of 12 House members on the road.

Contradiction: Assuming, rather than thorough planning leaves House with no immediately viable site for ELC relocation and one week behind schedule. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: A demonstration Town Meeting with 70 developmentally disabled persons in Dade County surprises professionals who work with them over their ability to work corporately through the three and a half hour meeting. Four Town Meetings are held, a total of 50 events will be completed as a result of the quarter's work.

Internal: The beginning of Advent is marked at the house with the wreath and at the church by participation in two significant acts of worship which use the calendar and forms out of Local Church Experiment.

Contradiction: Naming the victory of the quarter in such a way that motivates preparation of maneuvers which exploit present advantages into a future breakthrough. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS

External: House begins planning for continental council with corporate brooding. Management receives payback on TASC loan which enables sending out full program checks for past two months. Blue Skies Maneuver report excites all.

Internal: Abundant Thanksgiving celebration is held with Academy joining House and guests.

Contradiction: Enforcing corporate discipline and a new decision to produce. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Victory is won on the Community Center with the fulfillment of the contract. Contradiction: The gold rush has begun and we're still looking for the map. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Bruce Lanphear attends CYF in Indianapolis, visits to KCMO and KCK city governments open possibilities for CYFs and LENS in city. Regional Council in Lorimor makes concrete plans for HDTs in Lorimor and the Iowa Campaign.

Internal: Dallas Ziegenhorn attends dental seminar, Rusell Wheellock goes to vocational education meeting in California and Donna Ziegenhorn opens a new House Box Service in Oklahoma with hot-air balloon ride.

Contradiction: Securing 1980 funding from willing corporations that are now making budget decisions while still not having a thought-through financial story for the Lorimor HDTs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Northlands Campaign mid-course review illuminates the effectivity of LENS as the planning tool for campaigns as we see that key strategies were right on and working. Marshall County has agreed to be the first pilot with a County LENS and 10 Town Meetings. House sends out Joe and Delores Killian, retired couple, for six months in Azpitia.

Internal: Fantastic celebration at end of day is held after Metro colleagues joined House staff in warming the house with attic insulation and covering fireplaces with glass doors.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Christmas mailing is sent out to all regional colleagues and Town Meeting grads. Mark Harvey is sent out to Continental Council. East St. Louis CYF is set.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with gift exchange and festive meal with accordian accompaniment by Karl Miller.

Contradiction: Preparing to charge into the new year knowing that we must leap over the impending Christmas holiday. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Local Development Corporation holds election of officers and adopts bylaws.

Internal: Advent begins with visit from Santa to House and Mini Park.

Contradiction: Delivering methods training while honoring existing structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

Internal: Informal Community Corporation Board Meeting happens around Mike's bed. Local man calls to ask for help in starting a garage/gas station.

Contradiction: Converting all the learnings and decisions from the Council into practical events on a realistic timeline. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Joni Fleischman and two others are first youth elected to the Board of Mapleton-Fall Creek Neighborhood Association and Neighborhood Youth Council meets at House to go Christmas carolling and have a celebration.

Internal: Entire House attends Continental Council and begins a round of cadre Christmas celebrations from Lafayette to Louisville.

Contradiction: Moving into the 80's with power on all fronts. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Reverend Mother of Mercy High School says "yes" to classroom Town Meeting demonstrations and releases time for CYF participation in February.

Internal: Four from the House and four from the Metro attend Continental Council resulting in vision clarification and new resolve for six month strategies.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

Internal: RS-1 study reminds House that the Church was not making up the realities God, Christ, Holy Spirit and Church.

Contradiction: Focusing dissipated House energy. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Night at the Institute draws new audience and demonstrates how local man in USA is impacted by local man's efforts across the world. Global film showing catalyzes second showing in church.

Internal: There's new liveliness in House as Everal returns from Academy with glowing reports and immediately recruits one for the spring Academy.

Contradiction: "Finishing the framing" so House can move into impact event setup. (Wk. 12)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: The Urban Summit hosted by Loisida, with three urban communities represented reflects on implications of the urban probes of this quarter. Evening at the Institute, hosted by Vice-president of a major transnational corporation, draws 25.

Internal: Collegium conversations on Iran and framing within the historical church create mood of reflection on our relationship to the world religions at this point in history.

Contradiction: Hosting committed colleagues gracefully at Christmas and New Year celebrations while getting the bottom line of \$1000. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Follow-up with communities and colleagues reveals shift in activity and new openness stirring.

Internal: House celebrates the beginning of the Year of Church as the Purple of Advent reminds us of our roots in the historical church.

Contradiction: Standing before the tactical plan that secures the one victory. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

Christmas VOICE invites townwide participation in Heritage Christmas event.

Internal: House presence is transformed with paint and decor for hosting the community board for dinner.

Contradiction: Racing Sleigh '79 to the finish line of the decade so that preparations are secured for a winning winter quarter. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Participation in New England Guardians Meeting in Boston, Urban Summit in New York, and CYF presentation to Methodist Church in Augusta, Maine scatters House in many directions.

Internal: Old and new colleagues come by to see how they can participate, and work on proposals and advocacy.

Contradiction: Building screens to inform us how effectively to hold the tension among many demands and possibilities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: November Foro Campaign wins with five in State of Bolivar, nine in Barlovento (villages around Cano Negro) and forces continue to move west across Venezuela.

Internal: T-Day feast host two from Sons of Mary, Jim Campbell and Marilyn Quintana.

Contradiction: Creating the context that cuts across specialization and expands use of troops. (Wk. 11)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Over 25 farmers of Sol, meet to discuss the Agriculture Strategy for 1980, elects a representative group of six and articulate their distrust of each other and yet necessity of cooperative action.

Internal: Joaquina Rodriguez graduates from Agricultural School and the House celebrates Talos birthday.

Contradiction: Modifying community organization to keep up with creative changes in the community. (Wk. 1)

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: The Junior Health Caretakers participate in an excursion to Rio Bonito to visit a dentist and a hospital, which is the first time out of Bananeiras for many of them. Three women are sent to Rio de Janeiro for bakery training with Fleischmann Yeast's baking school. Chemicals are inkinded from EMATER-Rio to nurture sprouting plants. Home gardens numbers 22 and 23 go up, one of them is the demonstration covered garden. Children in the after-school program, dressed in yellow scarves with the program symbol, clean, weed and whitewash rocks for the preschool on Community Day.

Internal: Jim Campbell spends two days in Manaus en route to Caracas as a result of the change in government in Bolivia and subsequent slowdown of Air Bolivia flights.

Contradiction: Refocusing the thrust of the Project for the next six weeks to build on victories that are at hand. (Wk. 8)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Incredible construction momentum and enthusiasm erupt as roof of pre-school is completed and work on industrial shed begins.

Internal: Engine falls out of van while carrying site visitor from Royal Bank, leaving House without independent transport.

Contradiction: Finding the methods to use local man's wisdom fully. (Wk. 11)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Fifty farmers gather to learn about the drip irrigation possibilities for Conacaste. Sector leaders discuss the Bread for the World proposal and decide to get community signatures in its support. Eight women gather for luncheon in Conacaste and discuss future GWFs and begin strategy.

Internal: Leonel Sifuentes, ITI grad, sojourns in House and plugs in to work on Industrial Park.

Contradiction: Keeping tight hold on the reins as many possibilities start picking up and start tugging in all directions, wanting to run. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: The new primary school is sanded, painted, and blessed. The preschool has its first graduation followed by a visit by the Ministry of Education with an offer to build a pre-school and staff it. Community Assembly is called by the Village Council to discuss the legal structure of the Project.

Internal: Mike Hoff visits to look over the books.

Contradiction: Creating structures to do detailed long term planning. (Wk. 12)

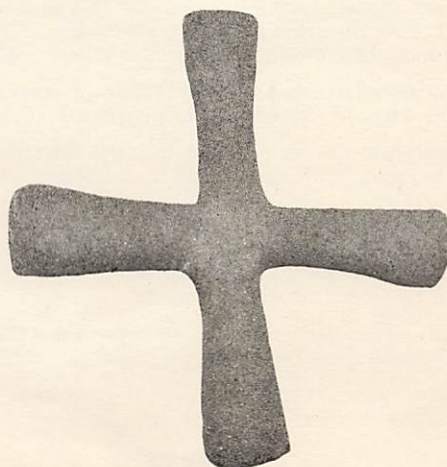

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

Internal: House celebrates 25th birthdays of Owolola Olatunji and Charles Jago three days apart.

Contradiction: Setting the structures which will carry all activities through the middle of January. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Visit with French Ministry of Cooperation opens new avenues for their support in Francophone Africa. Guardian, Gerald Nani, does week of framing calls and gets out his calendar to look at possibility of going on West Africa framing trip in January.

Internal: Fast is followed by very early morning feast, which enables new self-consciousness of the dynamics of the feast.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of one thrust when in two locations. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Evening at the Institute is held at House with 17 colleagues and new acquaintances in attendance to hear report on Kenya with slides given by Johannes Bruckner and Harry Jannsen. Colleagues help with enablement and tour House during show. Two registrations for Christmas trek follow within two days.

Internal: House discovers the power of the facility in telling the movement story.

Contradiction: Taking time to pull together and train self-conscious movement so that limited resources expand to fill the program opportunities available. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Christmas Market takes place as key community event generating large community participation. Thirteen thousand people attend the market with 5600 DM income for Project. Full day street program with Turkish and German bands and artistic groups entertain whole community.

Internal: Residence permit for Mike Deloughery is promised and fine decor for Advent transforms space.

Contradiction: Overcoming the fear and unclarity of the socio-economic dynamic working hand-in-hand. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Collegiums create plans for awakenment and colleague engagement for first quarter of New Decade, while most of House sent to enable area trek.

Internal: Christmas celebrations include night at the movies and Christmas dinner at colleagues home.

Contradiction: Making time commitments before determining missional focus. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP

External: Presentation on Community Development to Scandinavians and Canadians at Presidents' Citizenship College followed by a Kapini site visit, and visits from Anglo-American, Barclays Bank, TIMES of Zambia and CUSA Co-op Loan Association are sharp reminders of Kapini's visibility to the nation. Highlights from the Guilds include Under Five Clinic with 146 vaccinated, 24 pregnant women seen and a count of 17 babies born last month; the re-opening of the General Store; five varieties of vegetables planted at the Demonstration Farm; and workdays at the primary and pre-school.

Internal: House sends out two Catholic aspirants following their six-month sojourn and welcomes Mr. Dethe and Eusebion Muloshi's fiancée, Felisters and grand news of a February wedding.

Contradiction: Expanding the Project vision despite immediate farming demands and struggle with economic productivity units. (Wk. 12)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE :CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: The seeds are in the ground of the high desert land behind Bayad, possibly for the first time in the history of the earth. Meanwhile, 51 galabayas, 35 scarves, 14 hats, and entire inventory of marmalade is sold in Germany and Maadi, an international suburb of Cairo.

Internal: Pooles are sent to Bi-Continental Council in Brussels.

Contradiction: Finding ways for village to propel itself toward the transition in June. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Great week of events with HDTI graduation of 33 who have decided to be the "New Village Movement". Quarter II maneuvers are built by the largest Area Nairobi Council. Three new houses commissioned, "old" houses and support system troupes reaffirm their decision to do the

mission. New Villages of Kyuluni, Kilisa and Ulutya ready for consults in January. Operations, old hands and new, prepares to do awakenment events: 45 Village Meetings and eight location assemblies, the remaining three divisions in Machakos.

Internal: Dr. Dethé stops over for two days on way from Kapini to El Bayad. Staff celebrates 16 years of Kenya's independence by participating in Jamhuri Day event with the nation and a picnic lunch. House invited to Firestone Christmas party at Nairobi Hilton and enjoys drinks and meat.

Contradiction: Imaginably and practically keeping all fronts winning when the fronts have doubled. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcel's community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Representatives from each division meet with Global Methods School to plan Actuation Module for closing week of GMS when district team counterparts come to Maliwada to build maneuvers for each district till end of quarter. Women in GMS meet with area to plan women's advancement actuation module.

Internal: Participating in *Ancient of Days* conversation during Actuation module in GMS gives new myths to stand before in ongoing process of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: How to publish new song book before Council. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: Support of Bubun HDTs Cluster Consults, Sungai Lui Community Assembly and Area Sydney OE Financing provide occasions for great creativity and expenditure.

Internal: Fasting day provides occasion for reflection on points of significant engagement of year.

Contradiction: Covering all January Councils, Band Meetings and program events with personnel, models and financial underpinning is a real challenge. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Date set for Village Assembly and consensus on village company made by leadership core. Teachers training and English classes continue each week during School vacation. M\$ 2,500 raised by development.

Internal: Kathy Reese and Tom visit from HDTs in Bubun while getting visas renewed. Judy begins her job at Kentucky Fried Chicken.

Contradiction: Appropriating the nonchalance of the village while ensuring that all that is necessary happens. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Key leader of Ministry of Home Affairs helps ICA to strengthen national and provincial frames. Nurada kicks off construction of community center with 50-person Gotong Royong workday. Land deal is negotiated by villagers and government.

Internal: A. Paul's baby girl arrives three weeks early, just 12 hours after Antony arrives on the scene from Bubun.

Contradiction: Realizing government decision in December to enable extension in September, 1980, while at the same time intensifying the demonstration so that every local government office will beg for extension. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Fourth DOOP, the Human Development Module, with focus on living environment brings out master plan design for Bubun. Ur image impact is great with releasing celebration Saturday night with food, singing, and dancing from the six urs. Provincial head of rural development speaks to HDTs participants about Governor's seven prognoses for village development and challenges Bubun to leap rest of way from undeveloped to developed village.

Internal: Kaz study in HDTs gives images to the "cry" struggle to articulate in familiar Islamic terms.

Contradiction: Creating the mythology to sustain the movement which is forming before our eyes. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP

External: Total of 41 TMs in eight day campaign finished in spite of rain and floods. Women's classes and cooking demonstrations continue with Kabupaten and Kecamatan (County and District) women leadership. LENS marketing with Kadin (Chamber of Commerce) yields 4 companies registered out of 12 visited Provincial Parliament chairman writes to Governor requesting the Provincial Government to ask ICA to locate the HDTs in South Sulawesi in the next year and requests LENS for government officials and volunteer groups in South Sulawesi.

Internal: Creating a global fast montage on Area contradiction explodes images of the staff relative to Area relationships and provides a new depth to fasting and feasting on behalf of the world.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate discipline and structure in the midst of intensive campaign as house approaches end of the quarter. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Consult task force is sent to Sudtonggan for set-up. House is dispersed in mission across the zone with four Development treks in three nations and closing week of Sudtonggan HDTs.

Internal: Advent reflection and *Ice Age Man* study powerfully enable brooding on role and nature of the Religious in society.

Contradiction: Clarifying time design for study and reflection necessary for weeks preceding SEAPAC Council. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Development trek brings \$1500 (H.K).

Internal: Nexus and House spend Saturday making decor for Seapac Council and celebrates with feast at Ho Chung Restaurant.

Contradiction: Developing comprehensive picture of new Regional Strategy. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAUHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Global Film showing provides much needed context for growing group of Guardians and opens new doors for TWC. Community journey is enhanced with house-to-house visits with Hai Ou history and three villagers commit themselves to forthcoming SEAPAC tour at the regular community meeting. Construction on the Activity Centre continues with completion of pillars on second floor.

Internal: House sends out Linda Yang to Taipei to help with development and celebrates a great week with an adventurous trek to the mountains.

Contradiction: Finding the Chinese *Those Who Care* to release the next quarter's victories. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: It is a week of inkind victories with Toyota Jeepney for Mactan delivered to boat and with Rancie cloth for teachers' uniforms for 20 new Mactan preschools. There are also breakthroughs with companies including two inquiries about doing projects cooperatively around company plantations, endorsement by Japanese Chamber of Commerce and LENS seminar set for January with San Miguel Corporation.

Internal: House is visited by two Oyubari residents returning from Sudtonggan trip.

Contradiction: Focusing all programs into one national thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: China Television Corporation assists us for second time by transposing global film from 16 mm movie to video tape. Fifteen Chinese companies of Top 500 industrials in Taiwan visited in 3 days, half the visits done in Chinese.

Internal: Hong Kong development staff arrive for one week trek. Christmas decor enlivens House.

Contradiction: Getting our plans for the winter and spring quarters into tactics we can move on. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Four-ring circus initiates girding Mactan Coral Reef with 24 carat gold crown as four 15-man teams march across rock fields and fish ponds in the rain to launch first four of 24 villages. By the time of second set of four consults on Thursday and Friday, City Officials eagerly sign up to attend closing feasts and island grapevine is overflowing. Contradiction: Combining on-site methods training and 100 percent 'eventfulness' in the consults which will ensure 24 activated Early Learning Nutrition Centers on Mactan on January 2, 1980. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Eight thousand more cacao seeds are delivered to Luman HDP, Carmen HDP, LaPaz HDP, and Magtuod HDP. Irrigation proposal for Luman HDP is approved for funding by regional government. Farm Systems Development Corporation, the Davao City Mayor, and Regional Director of MLDCG endorse proposal to expand Langub HDP water system and to send it to Manila.

Internal: New water tank is installed inside the kitchen and staff training collegiums on JWM talks, SEAPAC grid, and global news continue to undergird the House.

Contradiction: Designing an operational system to continue the acceleration of programs while dealing with very limited funds. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: A one day consultation (3/5 of a LENS Seminar) led by one ICA staff and one Guardian is held for 20 managers of the Dentsu PR Center, Ltd., a subsidiary of the world's largest advertising company, and yields a fine new plan for company training, a substantial fee (\$750) and the probability of further work with the company.

Internal: Christmas party scores big with 35 in attendance coming from six nations; "Silent Night" is sung in four languages simultaneously.

Contradiction: Keeping a steady, gentle pressure behind all 23 major maneuvers and initiatives that are currently in the works so that one does not die due to a lack of attention. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Experimental series of declaration missions is completed with twelfth in Sang Yang Ri.

Internal: Passage film impacts House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythm while dancing so close to the edge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Visit with key bank colleague lays track for Quarter III development and housing issues. Clergy visits produce several hundred dollars and February PLC

Internal: Discovery of an insightful book on Korean customs stimulates move toward common regional study. Fine Ecclesiola celebration reminds us of the enduring value of that structure.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in go position for quarter III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: The head county officials, 50 strong, came to the village at the invitation of the villagers to have roast pig. It was to thank the county for its help in making the project a great success.

Internal: A six foot Christmas tree is provided for the House by the Army Chaplain at Camp Paze.

Contradiction: Waiting is a most difficult form of engagement to plan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House continues development and raises \$250. Nagasaki's 18 impact events are confirmed. A volunteer continues setting up development calls. January 12 receives boost with 75 people at Year End Party at ICA.

Internal: After Year End Party, volunteers stay over, Karikosis came to visit, and 13 sit down for breakfast the next day.

Contradiction: Sustaining the momentum during the Holiday Season and planning for the next six months. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Ishikawa prefecture proves to us that persistent patience pays off as they schedule a Town Meeting for January. Stronghold planning for Nara prefecture continues as last year's coordinator takes circuit team on a three hour tour of Yoshino and schedules a presentation for social education directors from every community in the prefecture.

Internal: Sushila Joshi returns to Osaka for a two day visit and life in the House is even busier than usual with people coming to see Sushila during her stay.

Contradiction: Keeping your eyes on the landmarks which enables you to plough the straight furrows. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Eleven English speaking society students from Hokkaido Agriculture University attend Evening at the Institute. Economic research continues with Ski Association. TM authorization is obtained in neighboring village. Work continues on three Christmas parties for this weekend.

Internal: Butcher hobbies to first place in Oyubari basketball tournament.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to engage all segments of the whole community both in and outside of Oyubari. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Second great assault takes place on the new Australian myth through preparing, procuring, printing and stuffing of 700 ICA Newsletters, including grassroots development appeal to 283. Names 12 tracking towns for corporate Research project.

Internal: Great House Christmas Party includes corporate feast (everyone makes his or her own favorite dish). Christmas carols, gift exchange and combined musical talent heretofore unheard.

Contradiction: Becoming entangled from the claims of Quarter II in order to get the jump on Quarter. III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Exciting Open House event is held Wednesday night with 15 guests including RS-1 grads, long-time colleagues and new friends. Six month maneuvers are prepared, printed and placed on a timeline. Key Development appointments are set for next weeks Development thrust.

Internal: The last piece of decor is hung in the lounge just in time for the Open House.

Contradiction: Discerning and stating the one thing we are out to do in the midst of all the tactics and maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: RS-1 scheduled and site selected as recruitment begins.

Internal Spirit care symbolized by decorating the Christmas tree and by collegial calls from other houses.

Contradiction: Being disengaged while still remaining in house during discontinuity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Regional Council of 14 grabs ahold of the challenges facing the Murrin Bridge economic development and Portland demonstration community vision with maturity and commitment. Guardian brings his \$205 cheque for Murrin Bridge table and takes professional photos of the products to sell to his neighbors and friends.

Internal: Baker family is sent out to Advent discontinuity before Joanne's baby arrives.

Contradiction: Utilizing discontinuity to maximize missional effectiveness. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Community plans and brings into being its own Christmas celebration and parties, Walkabout II completed for this quarter with visits to two Aboriginal Communities. Leadership is provided by two new Health community worker staff. Several men in community decide to work again in the Industry.

Internal: House sends out four week sojourner Sergie Messina. Betonte youth arrive for Christmas.

Contradiction: Getting community on death ground in relation to self-sufficiency in midst of continuing willingness to rely on handouts. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Christmas mailing prepared for grassroots year end contributions. Calendars for next quarter enliven office space. House assumes responsibility for Summer Youth Program. CYF set-up for January.

Internal: House celebrates birthday and arrival of Christmas tree. Garden planted with vegetables galore.

Contradiction: Operating out of a winning model now that year's plan has new values and is out of focus. (Wk. 1)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Severe tidal wave destroys much of Majuro (D-U-D area) including the Majuro House. President Carter declares Majuro a US federal disaster area. ICA and TASC staff become the supply liaison and hold three orientation sessions for the 30 American Red Cross volunteers and staff flown in. Sales at TASC continue to the few customers still in business and increase to Red Cross and US Army who set up three tent cities and feed 10,000 daily.

Internal: Baileys return for Regional Council glad to have a room instead of a tent, and ongoing House structures offer an island of normalcy in a sea of chaos.

Contradiction: Transforming the disaster wave into a creative wave that allows the refinancing of TASC. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Savair Loto, 1974 ITI grad, witnesses to the ITI as training for replication in the Pacific and 10 Salani villagers sign up.

Internal: The fishing boat supplies food for the House in addition to an economic victory for the village.

Contradiction: Quickly capitalizing an interest in the ITI to move six people to decide to staff 3 new area Suva Houses in August. (Wk. 2)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: US Fish and Wildlife service is the highlight of the week with a Special Issues Forum set up in virgin territory, a \$6000 check for October expenses and LENS program, and a great workshop which convinces the staff to trust the method. Ernie Leonard from US F & W goes to Continental Council along with regional colleagues, Roberta Beebe and David St. John.

Internal: The week begins with Mark Rebstock's 12th birthday and ends with a self-support house cleaning and painting maneuver employing half the house in Sacramento while the roaches get bombed in the kitchen.

Contradiction: Getting ready for the 80's when our head is still in the 70's. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: Fernando Campos arrives from Guatemala and his welcome is aided by four colleagues in Richgrove who speak to him in Spanish.

Contradiction: Building more adequate structures to maintain a broad base of community engagement and support. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Swelling spirit of community in Cusick becomes visible during week of Christmas decoration of private homes plus 18 foot community Christmas tree and giant lighted cross on water tower. Week is climaxed by gala potluck celebration of the 75th edition of the community newsletter.

Internal: House sends out the Dick Losh family and Marie Sharp to Continental Council in Chicago.

Contradiction: Continuing nuts and bolts of in-kind, files, Community Service Center construction, and ongoing programs in midst of Christmas celebrations, Continental Council updating, and quarter planning. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: House centers last newsletter of the year on global events from the GOR bringing surprise and delight to those preparing it for mailing.

Internal: Youth cluster and friends celebrate the end of 1979 with in-kind pizza and 16 free tickets to first run showing of Star Trek.

Contradiction: Gearing up for another week of Development and no messiahs in sight. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Church network in San Bernardino metro is opened with two film showings. Tulare Demonstration Community Cluster is launched with day long strategies planning meeting attended by 50 people from six communities. House participates in week LENS training in San Francisco.

Internal: Fantastic Week II economic, political and cultural odyssey in Mexico includes total House and regional colleagues in three carfals.

Contradiction: Turning exploding openings into concrete advantages for a year long strategy. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Winds up the year in a blaze of fulfillment as we participate in the \$1.2 million campaign, with colleagues committing over \$1,000.

Internal: Discontinuity finds us scattered from Denver to Prescott, nurturing colleagues along the way, and brooding over the maneuvers necessary to achieve the 79-80 wins we consensed last September.

Contradiction: Standing in an unclear four year vision. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

Contradiction: Discerning the forms for future community engagement after completing first year with Vista. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Community Forum is held on Rocky Boy (Chippawa-Cree) reservation with 53 in attendance for an all day meeting in the gymnasium. High school class attends and sets date for CVF in January.

Internal: Fantastic House Church welcomes back Philbrooks from Continental Council and celebrates Rob and Catherine Bartlett's first anniversary.

Contradiction: Allowing the discontinuity of this season to be creative in its impact when it seems everything has been discontinuous all quarter in the midst of complex self-support and circuit schedules. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cannon Ball expansion takes off again as Kenel TM excites local residents who discuss which two from their district should attend the HDTS. Industry leaps forward as it receives \$5800 order from one buyer.

Internal: House steps out for evening on the town before ending with 2 a.m. breakfast before the long ride home.

Contradiction: Breaking through the limited strategic plans for expansion which restrict Project movement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Development victory nets \$10,600 in hand with more committed by end of year. Rocky Mountain High Maneuver (revisiting all of Colorado's towns who held TMs) continues with excellent responses and several requests for future workshops.

Internal: Ecclesiola creates Regional symbol for the 80s and plans New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Finishing the wrapping of regional Christmas gifts in time to place under tree for victory celebration. (Wk. 13)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Community Forum Breton and five other events see 75 people participate in CFC dynamic which is good news for the Alberta 75 Campaign.

Internal: Ecclesiola is moved to Saturday night to catch more than one at home.

Contradiction: Focusing the invitation at the point where people have their passion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Two great Community Forums are held in Huntingdon and Jubilee on the same night as two coffee break demonstration forums involving six colleagues and 57 CFC participants and netting \$236.

Internal: Ecclesiola held with only the four House members strikes a balance with the heavy colleague participation of the last one and a half months.

Contradiction: Continuing to have great victories even through the Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Two women pick up crafts coop responsibility while Eartha is at HDTS.

Internal: Martha's first full week of permeation yield salary and \$50 in tips.

Contradiction: Achieving critical victories in midst of radical dispersion. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Saskatoon House participates in signal Continental Council which is the most intensive, most destinal, and the most local-man-participating-in experienced in a long while.

Internal: In preparation for Council, House zooms through the vision, contradictions, and proposals for the region for the next four years in three short sessions.

Internal: Gay Kennedy is sent to the HDTS.

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Twenty-nine folks from four of the six regions of

Area Houston participate in the Voyage. Computer prints 825 Regional newsletter labels. Teams explore six urban demonstration community prospects selected by Chamber of Commerce. Trull Foundation says "yes" to \$5K for Town Meeting.

Internal: Thirty-two feast on 37 pounds of turkey, 11 pies and more for Thanksgiving dinner.

Contradiction: Naming the victory that history needs from the Houston Region before January 1 in the face of uncertainty about how to break loose a forum schedule while society's mindset turns more and more toward Christmas and the holidays. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Community leadership gathers for eight hours of planning next six months with reports on Continental Council and HDTS that marks significant grasp of the profound happening of awakening. A HUD official makes site visit in regards to Indianoma's Block Grant Application.

Internal: EG gain new appreciation of the mystery of wildlife around Indianoma on a tour of the Refugee through herds of buffalo, longhorn cattle, elk, deer and prairie dogs.

Contradiction: Waiting on miracles when the miracle is within us. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Town Meeting held in Fayetteville, Arkansas is set up by colleague David Beal, who is now attending HDTS in Chicago.

Internal: Luigi Persichetti attends HDTS for Economic Cycle and Jill Rodda joins HDTS for final three weeks

Contradiction: Using the holiday season as an advantage in eliciting bureaucratic and colleague engagement (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Development phone blitz and New Year's Eve celebration planning completed in midst of sorting responses to Regional Newsletter mailing.

Internal: Homecoming from discontinuity highlighted by hosting guests: Masayo and Yoshi Koshiyama, Ray and Bernhard Knutsen.

Contradiction: Transforming 19th century office space into 21st century space craft. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Cluster assembly plans are firmed up as eight towns respond and sign up to participate. Office of Energy strategy is built for the 80's and work begins with transition teams from new Governor elect, William Winter's, office.

Internal: House has a week of celebrations as colleague comes to dinner and Christmas tree and decor go up.

Contradiction: Creating necessary models and momentum that will kick House into 1980 in the midst of time demands and limits of Council, Christmas discontinuity, and courting new government administration. (Wk. 12)

External: Preliminary meeting in Calliope Urban Housing Development to set up cluster of 10 forums brings receptive response from this self managing development of 1500 units.

Internal: Eloise Patton is welcomed back from Academy. House experiences discontinuity and hosts Clements and Ennis family.

Contradiction: Redirecting celebrative spirit of discontinuity to missional engagement. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Evening at the Institute in holiday season renews relationship with old and acquaints new colleague.

Internal: Celebration of Advent brings refreshing new hope to the grind of proposal rewriting after Week II is spent preparing the new draft for TM saturation in Arkansas.

Contradiction: Waiting for the State to inform House of the next move. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Seventy-five sophomores from Fulton H.S. Gifted Minorities program in Knoxville attend CYF which is broadcast on TV news program that evening. Key city-wide Atlanta GWF includes Dorothy Cotton (Region IV Action Director). Candler-Glenwood leadership training ends with evaluation and plans for weekly guild meetings for winter and spring quarters.

Internal: Ann Loy arrives from Knoxville to participate in Atlanta GWF.

Contradiction: Getting nod from key local frame for second phase of urban strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community moves in all Guild arenas as Town Council says "yes" to HUD Rural Initiations program, visit to E.L.C. Certification Office. Twelve youth at Guild meeting and one house member assists Miami House in Tallahassee Metro Donor Circuits and raises \$5018 which is two and a half times the bottom line.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with everyone cooking one dish creates corporate celebration in midst of having five of 12 House members on the road.

Contradiction: Assuming, rather than thorough planning leaves House with no immediately viable site for ELC relocation and one week behind schedule. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: A demonstration Town Meeting with 70 developmentally disabled persons in Dade County surprises professionals who work with them over their ability to work corporately through the three and a half hour meeting. Four Town Meetings are held, a total of 50 events will be completed as a result of the quarter's work.

Internal: The beginning of Advent is marked at the house with the wreath and at the church by participation in two significant acts of worship which use the calendar and forms out of Local Church Experiment.

Contradiction: Naming the victory of the quarter in such a way that motivates preparation of maneuvers which exploit present advantages into a future breakthrough. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: House begins planning for continental council with corporate brooding. Management receives payback on TASC loan which enables sending out full program checks for past two months. Blue Skies Maneuver report excites all.

Internal: Abundant Thanksgiving celebration is held with Academy joining House and guests.

Contradiction: Enforcing corporate discipline and a new decision to produce. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

Contradiction: The gold rush has begun and we're still looking for the map. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Bruce Lanphear attends CYF in Indianapolis, visits to KCMO and KCK city governments open possibilities for CYFs and LENS in city. Regional Council in Lorimor makes concrete plans for HDTs in Lorimor and the Iowa Campaign.

Internal: Dallas Ziegenhorn attends dental seminar, Russell Wheellock goes to vocational education meeting in California and Donna Ziegenhorn opens a new House Box Service in Oklahoma with hot-air balloon ride.

Contradiction: Securing 1980 funding from willing corporations that are now making budget decisions while still not having a thought-through financial story for the Lorimor HDTs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The Northlands Campaign mid-course review illuminates the effectivity of LENS as the planning tool for campaigns as we see that key strategies were right on and working. Marshall County has agreed to be the first pilot with a County LENS and 10 Town Meetings. House sends out Joe and Delores Killian, retired couple, for six months in Azpitia.

Internal: Fantastic celebration at end of day is held after Metro colleagues joined House staff in warming the house with attic insulation and covering fireplaces with glass doors.

Contradiction: Finding ways to work through networks in building major campaign. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Christmas mailing is sent out to all regional colleagues and Town Meeting grads. Mark Harvey is sent out to Continental Council. East St. Louis CYF is set.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with gift exchange and festive meal with accordion accompaniment by Karl Miller.

Contradiction: Preparing to charge into the new year knowing that we must leap over the impending Christmas holiday. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Local Development Corporation holds election of officers and adopts bylaws.

Internal: Advent begins with visit from Santa to House and Mini Park.

Contradiction: Delivering methods training while honoring existing structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

Internal: Informal Community Corporation Board Meeting happens around Mike's bed. Local man calls to ask for help in starting a garage/gas station.

Internal: Barbara's sister, Kinney youth, and invalid Mike join House at the Thanksgiving table, with 16 Kinney folks arriving later for dessert.

Contradiction: Doing the project and running the House, without neglecting either. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: As the House prepares for the arrival of the Chicago Area House for the New Year's Eve celebration at the home of a local colleague, our thermometer recording *Gifts for the 80's* is ruined as the mercury pushes through the top of the tube.

Internal: Our three youth depart to visit families, while the House hosts members of 2 families plus an additional family from Chicago Nexus for the holidays.

Contradiction: Enjoying the final pleasures of the 70's yet remaining conscious of the imminent maneuvers required to launch the 80's. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: The town board of Colfax, Indiana invites 10 nearby "Town Meeting" towns to January assembly. PLC registrations arrive from four states. Darrell Brown and Donna Marie Wheeler will be joining the Depauw University team to Conacaste enabling construction and the health team.

Internal: House dispenses from coast to coast for Christmas discontinuity.

Contradiction: Recruiting the Colfax Assembly and the PLC. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Reverend Mother of Mercy High School says "yes" to classroom Town Meeting demonstrations and releases time for CYF participation in February.

Internal: Four from the House and four from the Metro attend Continental Council resulting in vision clarification and new resolve for six month strategies.

Contradiction: Using quantitative training methods that enable local residents to lead quality events. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Munising Partner Conference recruitment takes a turn in depth as local folks get 70 firm commitments to attend the four hour planning conference January 17, 1980.

Internal: A journey through the 60's and 70's gives permission to deal with the 80's as New Year's Eve celebration theme that prepared for a great decade.

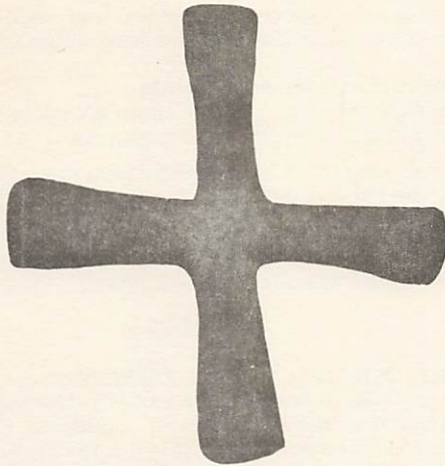
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: Bubun and Sungai Lui guests visit for discontinuity. Mail out 100 invitations for January Guardians event and began receiving "yes" response.

Internal: House disperses to mountains and beaches for discontinuity.

Contradiction: Moving confidently into Quarter III without having done Nexus planning. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Date set for Village Assembly and consensus on village company made by leadership core. Teachers training and English classes continue each week during School vacation. M\$ 2,500 raised by development.

Internal: Kathy Reese and Tom visit from HDTs in Bubun while getting visas renewed. Judy begins her job at Kentucky Fried Chicken.

Contradiction: Appropriating the nonchalance of the village while ensuring that all that is necessary happens. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Key leader of Ministry of Home Affairs helps ICA to strengthen national and provincial frames. Nurada kicks off construction of community center with 50-person Gotong Royong workday. Land deal is negotiated by villagers and government.

Internal: A. Paul's baby girl arrives three weeks early, just 12 hours after Antony arrives on the scene from Bubun.

Contradiction: Realizing government decision in December to enable extension in September, 1980, while at the same time intensifying the demonstration so that every local government office will beg for extension. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Fourth DOOP, the Human Development Module, with focus on living environment brings out master plan design for Bubun. Ur image impact is great with releasing celebration Saturday night with food, singing, and dancing from the six urs. Provincial head of rural development speaks to HDTs participants about Governor's seven prognoses for village development and challenges Bubun to leap rest of way from undeveloped to developed village.

Internal: Kaz study in HDTs gives images to the "cry" struggle to articulate in familiar Islamic terms.

Contradiction: Creating the mythology to sustain the movement which is forming before our eyes. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UJUNG PANDANG—BONTOA HDP

External: Total of 41 TMs in eight day campaign finished in spite of rain and floods. Women's classes and cooking demonstrations continue with Kabupaten and Kecamatan (County and District) women leadership. LENS marketing with Kadin (Chamber of Commerce) yields 4 companies registered out of 12 visited Provincial Parliament chairman writes to Governor requesting the Provincial Government to ask ICA to locate the HDTs in South Sulawesi in the next year and requests LENS for government officials and volunteer groups in South Sulawesi.

Internal: Creating a global fast montage on Area contradiction explodes images of the staff relative to Area relationships and provides a new depth to fasting and feasting on behalf of the world.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate discipline and structure in the midst of intensive campaign as house approaches end of the quarter. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS**

External: Nexus hosts colleagues, Guardians, and Order at Nexus Open House.

Internal: Crossnexus meeting with Singapore Nexus, symbolizes new continental unity of service for SEAPAC.

Contradiction: Starting quarter without clarity of Nexus role in area's new programs. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG—NAM WAI HDP

External: Nam Wai hosts 50 colleagues for Seapac Council.

Internal: House takes discontinuity.

Contradiction: Developing the regional strategy. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG—HAI OU HDP

External: Global Film showing provides much needed context for growing group of Guardians and opens new doors for TWC. Community journey is enhanced with house-to-house visits with Hai Ou history and three villagers commit themselves to forthcoming SEAPAC tour at the regular community meeting. Construction on the Activity Centre continues with completion of pillars on second floor.

Internal: House sends out Linda Yang to Taipei to help with development and celebrates a great week with an adventurous trek to the mountains.

Contradiction: Finding the Chinese *Those Who Care* to release the next quarter's victories. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: It is a week of inkind victories with Toyota Jeepney for Mactan delivered to boat and with Rancie cloth for teachers' uniforms for 20 new Mactan preschools. There are also breakthroughs with companies including two inquiries about doing projects cooperatively around company plantations, endorsement by Japanese Chamber of Commerce and LENS seminar set for January with San Miguel Corporation.

Internal: House is visited by two Oyubari residents returning from Sudtonggan trip.

Contradiction: Focusing all programs into one national thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: China Television Corporation assists us for second time by transposing global film from 16 mm movie to video tape. Fifteen Chinese companies of Top 500 industrials in Taiwan visited in 3 days, half the visits done in Chinese.

Internal: Hong Kong development staff arrive for one week trek. Christmas decor enlivens House.

Contradiction: Getting our plans for the winter and spring quarters into tactics we can move on. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Rollcall of the 24 during the Council of Villages (Mactan 24) signals completion of three weeks of consults and 48 new troops.

Internal: Dick Sims enlivens house with stories of Langub HDP miracles.

Contradiction: How to name "resurrected lives" out of recent HDTs grads without using classical religious symbols. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO—LANGUB HDP

External: Development Trek makes 56 calls and brings in 2,400 with more committed for January. Thirty one people complete registration for Philippine National Placement Test for school drop-outs. Four thousand cacao seedlings germinated in Valancia HDP. Langub HDP water system extends to demonstration Farm.

Internal: Welcome Dick Sims for Development Trek, Yodobulo Estorgio, and D. Gomez from HDTs staff begin planning for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Accelerating the five cluster HDP's. (Wk. 3)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: A one day consultation (3/5 of a LENS Seminar) led by one ICA staff and one Guardian is held for 20 managers of the Dentsu PR Center, Ltd., a subsidiary of the world's largest advertising company, and yields a fine new plan for company training, a substantial fee (\$750) and the probability of further work with the company.

Internal: Christmas party scores big with 35 in attendance coming from six nations; "Silent Night" is sung in four languages simultaneously.

Contradiction: Keeping a steady, gentle pressure behind all 23 major maneuvers and initiatives that are currently in the works so that one does not die due to a lack of attention. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Experimental series of declaration missions is completed with twelfth in Sang Yang Ri.

Internal: Passage film impacts House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythm while dancing so close to the edge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Visit with key bank colleague lays track for Quarter III development and housing issues. Clergy visits produce several hundred dollars and February PLC.

Internal: Discovery of an insightful book on Korean customs stimulates move toward common regional study. Fine Ecclesiola celebration reminds us of the enduring value of that structure.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in go position for Quarter III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHUNCHEON—KUH DU E RI HDP

External: Starts year fresh with the villagers deciding to sell 90% (60) of their pigs and 100% (9) of thin beef cattle from the corporate farm.

Internal: Mr. Park is sent out to SEAPAC meeting and Sampa ITI.

Contradiction: Making best use of school holidays. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House continues development and raises \$250. Nagasaki's 18 impact events are confirmed. A volunteer continues setting up development calls. January 12 receives boost with 75 people at Year End Party at ICA.

Internal: After Year End Party, volunteers stay over, Karikosis came to visit, and 13 sit down for breakfast the next day.

Contradiction: Sustaining the momentum during the Holiday Season and planning for the next six months. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: House reflects on victories of past quarter: the golding of our region, initiation of two strongholds, a deepening of the journey of the Osaka advisors, Weekly Friday Nights at the Institute with RS-I as a highlight and major celebrations, one of which hosted 56 people in an evening.

Internal: Discontinuity is used as a time to cement relationships with the neighbourhood, advisors, and Indian Community.

Contradiction: Turning the great number of fine colleagues into Japanese Priorship/Leadership. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI—OYUBARI HDP

External: Eleven English speaking society students from Hokkaido Agriculture University attend Evening at the Institute. Economic research continues with Ski Association. TM authorization is obtained in neighboring village. Work continues on three Christmas parties for this weekend.

Internal: Butcher hobbles to first place in Oyubari basketball tournament.

Contradiction: Finding new ways to engage all segments of the whole community both in and outside of Oyubari. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Second great assault takes place on the new Australian myth through preparing, procuring, printing and stuffing of 700 ICA Newsletters, including grassroots development appeal to 283. Names 12 tracking towns for corporate Research project.

Internal: Great House Christmas Party includes corporate feast (everyone makes his or her own favorite dish). Christmas carols, gift exchange and combined musical talent heretofore unheard.

Contradiction: Becoming entangled from the claims of Quarter II in order to get the jump on Quarter. III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Exciting Open House event is held Wednesday night with 15 guests including RS-I grads, long-time colleagues and new friends. Six month maneuvers are prepared, printed and placed on a timeline. Key Development appointments are set for next weeks Development thrust.

Internal: The last piece of decor is hung in the lounge just in time for the Open House.

Contradiction: Discerning and stating the one thing we are out to do in the midst of all the tactics and maneuvers. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: RS-1 scheduled and site selected as recruitment begins.

Internal Spirit care symbolized by decorating the Christmas tree and by collegial calls from other houses.

Contradiction: Being disengaged while still remaining in house during discontinuity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Regional colleagues, Phil Arkins and Paul Grundy and House meet with Portland, Vic. councilman to plan forums for coming year. Good visit with Guardians John and Lisa Little, who have returned to Australia after five years in Montreal area.

Internal: Sojourners and waysiders fill House with celebrations.

Contradiction: Participating in area training and council event in Sydney while in Melbourne. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: House and regional colleagues and families celebrate New Year's Eve marking the turn of a decade. Everyone reviews pictures on walls from Life Magazines highlighting each year of the 70's and reflect on where we have been and where we need to be in the 80's by placing two different colored yarn on a world map.

Internal: House completes six-month priority and timeline for the region which helps clarify our decision to care for all towns in the region.

Contradiction: Turning fine planning into set dates and actuated programs. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Christmas mailing prepared for grassroots year end contributions. Calendars for next quarter enliven office space. House assumes responsibility for Summer Youth Program. CYF set-up for January.

Internal: House celebrates birthday and arrival of Christmas tree. Garden planted with vegetables galore.

Contradiction: Operating out of a winning model now that year's plan has new values and is out of focus. (Wk. 1)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP

External: Severe tidal wave destroys much of Majuro (D-U-D area) including the Majuro House. President Carter declares Majuro a US federal disaster area. ICA and TASC staff become the supply liaison and hold three orientation sessions for the 30 American Red Cross volunteers and staff flown in. Sales at TASC continue to the few customers still in business and increase to Red Cross and US Army who set up three tent cities and feed 10,000 daily.

Internal: Baileys return for Regional Council glad to have a room instead of a tent, and ongoing House structures offer an island of normalcy in a sea of chaos.

Contradiction: Transforming the disaster wave into a creative wave that allows the refinancing of TASC. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Savair Loto, 1974 ITI grad, witnesses to the ITI as training for replication in the Pacific and 10 Salani villagers sign up.

Internal: The fishing boat supplies food for the House in addition to an economic victory for the village.

Contradiction: Quickly capitalizing an interest in the ITI to move six people to decide to staff 3 new area Suva Houses in August. (Wk. 2)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: US Fish and Wildlife service is the highlight of the week with a Special Issues Forum set up in virgin territory, a \$6000 check for October expenses and LENS program, and a great workshop which convinces the staff to trust the method. Ernie Leonard from US F & W goes to Continental Council along with regional colleagues, Roberta Beebe and David St. John.

Internal: The week begins with Mark Rebstock's 12th birthday and ends with a self-support house cleaning and painting maneuver employing half the house in Sacramento while the roaches get bombed in the kitchen.

Contradiction: Getting ready for the 80's when our head is still in the 70's. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: Fernando Campos arrives from Guatemala and his welcome is aided by four colleagues in Richgrove who speak to him in Spanish.

Contradiction: Building more adequate structures to maintain a broad base of community engagement and support. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO—CUSICK HDP

External: Regional Council identifies all the towns and cities of the region and looks at how to awaken and engage everyone. Boise circuit breaks open two possibilities for clusters of Town Meetings in Idaho. Community Core VISTA staff and auxiliary join to plan Quarter III for the project.

Internal: House returns from Regional Council on Oregon coast, sends two people on Boise circuit and regional prior family stops by to work on regional timeline.

Contradiction: Objectifying and timelining Quarter tactics to release winning expenditure. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: House leaps into the 80's with a great Regional Council on the Oregon Seacoast. On return does workshop in Idaho with statewide CAP directions, which leads to invitation to do Town Meeting package.

Internal: School vacation continues, youth expand their incomes with more working hours, and the Thursday Evening Roundtable focuses on the *Ethics of Development*.

Contradiction: Finding a springboard to release a quarter packed tight with events and activities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Claiming promises for the 80's at New Year's Eve celebration sets the vision for next six months and preparation for regional meeting concretizes the vision.

Internal: House families get together for Christmas and New Year celebrations and week intensive planning for next quarter evokes fear and fascination of the scope of missional engagement.

Contradiction: Securing good attendance at regional meeting which is key to colleague engagement in metro Impact events. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: RS-I recruitment, a \$1,000 Development pick up, the preparation of a Guardian newsletter, and Arizona T.M. follow up are all dimmed by a Problem Solving Unit session held suspended over the diamond blanket of Phoenix's evening.

Internal: Paul Clements prepares the House Church meal and leaves on a circuit to New Mexico on the day he is welcomed as an intern into the Order: Ecumenical.

Contradiction: Implementing Guardian's decision to engage and deciding the key tactic in relation to signal communities. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA—PISINEMO HDP

External: State Library program administrated by local VISTA volunteers donates \$1500 worth of educational supplies.

Internal: Three college women arrive for one month sojourn from Scranton, Pennsylvania.

Contradiction: Maximizing effectiveness of short term visitors in special projects. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Community Forum is held on Rocky Boy (Chippawa-Cree) reservation with 53 in attendance for an all day meeting in the gymnasium. High school class attends and sets date for CYF in January.

Internal: Fantastic House Church welcomes back Philbrooks from Continental Council and celebrates Rob and Catherine Bartlett's first anniversary.

Contradiction: Allowing the discontinuity of this season to be creative in its impact when it seems everything has been discontinuous all quarter in the midst of complex self-support and circuit schedules. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Cannon Ball expansion takes off again as Kenel TM excites local residents who discuss which two from their district should attend the HDTS. Industry leaps forward as it receives \$5800 order from one buyer.

Internal: House steps out for evening on the town before ending with 2 a.m. breakfast before the long ride home.

Contradiction: Breaking through the limited strategic plans for expansion which restrict Project movement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Development victory nets \$10,600 in hand with more committed by end of year. Rocky Mountain High Maneuver (revisiting all of Colorado's towns who held TMs) continues with excellent responses and several requests for future workshops.

Internal: Ecclesiola creates Regional symbol for the 80s and plans New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Finishing the wrapping of regional Christmas gifts in time to place under tree for victory celebration. (Wk. 13)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Saskatoon and Edmonton Houses plan jointly to celebrate the 75th anniversaries of Alberta and Saskatchewan with bi-regional strike forces intensifying the Forum push.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas in dispersion and gathers to prepare for the 80s.

Contradiction: Creating the House and maneuver dynamics that intensify the care for both regions and the sustenance of all the troops. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Two great Community Forums are held in Huntingdon and Jubilee on the same night as two coffee break demonstration forums involving six colleagues and 57 CFC participants and netting \$236.

Internal: Ecclesiola held with only the four House members strikes a balance with the heavy colleague participation of the last one and a half months.

Contradiction: Continuing to have great victories even through the Christmas holidays. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE—MINTO HDP

External: Two weeks of festivities around Christmas and New Year's with village work days potlatches and square dancing Minto style until 5 A.M. not hampered by 50-60 below zero weather. Vergil Titus speaks on responsibility and power of working together at New Year's Eve potlatch.

Internal: Tim and Martha join Minto staff for Christmas enabling the first full house celebration in two months.

Contradiction: Gaining momentum on economic ventures when Jack Frost freezes everyone. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Saskatoon House participates in signal Continental Council which is the most intensive, most destinal, and the most local-man-participating-in experienced in a long while.

Internal: In preparation for Council, House zooms through the vision, contradictions, and proposals for the region for the next four years in three short sessions.

Contradiction: Meshing wisdom and expenditure with colleagues across the region, area, and continent so that the world is assured of victory. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: The sawmill business loan is approved by the CEDF Board which will mean four more jobs in Vogar. Development team in Winnipeg returns with \$3,500 in hand.

Internal: Gay Kennedy is sent to the HDTs.

Contradiction: Discerning a strategy that will call forth and formulate Vogar community leadership quickly. (Wk. 9)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Twenty-nine folks from four of the six regions of Area Houston participate in the Voyage. Computer prints 825 Regional newsletter labels. Teams explore six urban demonstration community prospects selected by Chamber of Commerce. Trull Foundation says "yes" to \$5K for Town Meeting.

Internal: Thirty-two feast on 37 pounds of turkey, 11 pies and more for Thanksgiving dinner.

Contradiction: Naming the victory that history needs from the Houston Region before January 1 in the face of unclarity about how to break loose a forum schedule while society's mindset turns more and more toward Christmas and the holidays. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: Community leadership gathers for eight hours of planning next six months with reports on Continental Council and HDTs that marks significant grasp of the profound happening of awakening. A HUD official makes site visit in regards to Indianhoma's Block Grant Application.

Internal: EG gain new appreciation of the mystery of wildlife around Indianhoma on a tour of the Refugee through herds of buffalo, longhorn cattle, elk, deer and prairie dogs.

Contradiction: Waiting on miracles when the miracle is within us. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Town Meeting in Meadowood Acres, the first demonstration community, is a great event with 70 present and bilingual leadership by Asherton residents and the first proposed event scheduled before Christmas.

Internal: Phase I control unexpected flood when the water pipe breaks while all adults are out of town.

Contradiction: Walking the tightrope of creating broadened community frame. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Town Meeting held in Fayetteville, Arkansas is set up by colleague David Beal, who is now attending HDTs in Chicago.

Internal: Luigi Persichetti attends HDTs for Economic Cycle and Jill Rodda joins HDTs for final three weeks.

Contradiction: Using the holiday season as an advantage in eliciting bureaucratic and colleague engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Regional Council held in Indianhoma is highlighted by the creation of a new regional song entitled *Ya'll Care*.

Internal: The new year is celebrated with an intergalactic pizzeria and down-home square dancing.

Contradiction: Shifting into the action of the quarter knowing that the House can't let it fail and can't do it itself. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Cluster assembly plans are firmed up as eight towns respond and sign up to participate. Office of Energy strategy is built for the 80's and work begins with transition teams from new Governor elect, William Winter's, office.

Internal: House has a week of celebrations as colleague comes to dinner and Christmas tree and decor go up.

Contradiction: Creating necessary models and momentum that will kick House into 1980 in the midst of time demands and limits of Council, Christmas discontinuity, and courting new government administration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Preliminary meeting in Calliope Urban Housing Development to set up cluster of 10 forums brings receptive response from this self managing development of 1500 units.

Internal: Eloise Patton is welcomed back from Academy. House experiences discontinuity and hosts Clements and Ennis family.

Contradiction: Redirecting celebrative spirit of discontinuity to missional engagement. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Evening at the Institute in holiday season renews relationship with old and acquaints new colleague.

Internal: Celebration of Advent brings refreshing new hope to the grind of proposal rewriting after Week II is spent preparing the new draft for TM saturation in Arkansas.

Contradiction: Waiting for the State to inform House of the next move. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: New Year's retreat, sponsored by Guardians with 32 around the table, reflects on 70s and visions 80s. Following weekend regional council is held as gears are set in motion for March Gibson HDTs.

Internal: New ecclesiola launches quarter. Major inkind victories for regional council include 400 apple and sweet potato pies.

Contradiction: Getting critical mass going in several strategic arenas so quarter won't be dribbled. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community moves in all Guild arenas as Town Council says "yes" to HUD Rural Initiations program, visit to E.L.C. Certification Office. Twelve youth at Guild meeting and one house member assists Miami House in Tallahassee Metro Donor Circuits and raises \$5018 which is two and a half times the bottom line.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with everyone cooking one dish creates corporate celebration in midst of having five of 12 House members on the road.

Contradiction: Assuming, rather than thorough planning leaves House with no immediately viable site for ELC relocation and one week behind schedule. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The Global film showing before 82 members of Church Women United brings requests to see the film in four new locations. Practical details for Consumer Conference Town Meetings with developmentally disabled are worked out in a Miami Conference with state agency people. Quarter Planning targets three geographic areas in District 6. Christmas phoning raises \$500.

Internal: Self support is dealt with in House blitz for jobs in January; David begins new job.

Contradiction: Solidifying our six months vision in such a way that practices get sorted out from tasks so momentum needed to do 100 events is generated. (Wk. 3)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: House begins planning for continental council with corporate brooding. Management receives paycheck on TASC loan which enables sending out full program checks for past two months. Blue Skies Maneuver report excites all.

Internal: Abundant Thanksgiving celebration is held with Academy joining House and guests.

Contradiction: Enforcing corporate discipline and a new decision to produce. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: A phenomenal Week II of planning lays out the 26 priorities for the next 26 weeks for the Chicago House. In addition to massive work for six posts, we decide on 16 special three week maneuvers over the six months.

Internal: Seeing the whole journey of transition including moving the House location within 5th City has an awe inspiring impact on all.

Contradiction: Creating symbols and time rhythm to "shoot" us effectively through the 26 weeks. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA—LORIMOR HDP

External: Workday with 19 present closes in Community Center for the Winter. Applications are now being taken for housing rehab under \$323,000 Community Development Block Grant (\$160,000 towards housing). Halloween is appropriately celebrated with trick-or-treats and 100 kids through a Haunted House.

Internal: House celebrates Heidi Zahrt's birthday as she turns 16.

Contradiction: The gold rush has begun and we're still looking for the map. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Bruce Lanphear attends CYF in Indianapolis, visits to KCMO and KCK city governments open possibilities for CYFs and LENS in city. Regional Council in Lorimor makes concrete plans for HDTs in Lorimor and the Iowa Campaign.

Internal: Dallas Ziegenhorn attends dental seminar, Russell Wheellock goes to vocational education meeting in California and Donna Ziegenhorn opens a new House Box Service in Oklahoma with hot-air balloon ride.

Contradiction: Securing 1980 funding from willing corporations that are now making budget decisions while still not having a thought-through financial story for the Lorimor HDTs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: The New Years season is dealt with in style. The final week of the 70's saw colleagues calling the movement on the phone and netting \$2000 for the *Gifts of the 80s Campaign*, followed by a four hour symposium on discerning the challenges of the 80s on the final day. The launching of the year was done via celebrating with fine wine, song and feast.

Internal: All house and metro colleagues return from discontinuity and reunite themselves with homebase through a workday in which the basement, kitchen and lounge get major facelifts.

Contradiction: Organizing the tasks ahead into manageable inclusive strategic targets. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Mark Harvey and Karen Mathis go to Kansas City to the Missouri-Iowa strategy meeting. House and metro meeting leads to new metro investment in ESL prep.

Internal: Total house returns from discontinuity; Mary and Bridget Crane arrive to fill new assignments.

Contradiction: Locating creative self-support options to release full missional potential. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Local Development Corporation holds election of officers and adopts bylaws.

Internal: Advent begins with visit from Santa to House and Mini Park.

Contradiction: Delivering methods training while honoring existing structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Stake Directory gets jump ahead with visiting door-to-door and calling.

Internal: Community resident trains Barbara and Addie on fixing furnace. Quarterly planning focuses on training in methods for community.

Contradiction: Finding the rhythm appropriate for a new decade. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The House conducts Quarter III and IV battleplanning of vision, contradictions, proposals, and tactical arenas as input for a Week 2 battleplanning workshop with local colleagues.

Internal: The House welcomes 20 persons from the Chicago Area House for a joyous celebration of the first New Years Eve of the 80s held at the home of local colleagues.

Contradiction: Realizing in the midst of great joyousness, that performance of missional task is ever more exciting and fulfilling than discontinuity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: John Bengel departs for two weeks in Conacaste with team of 35 engineers, doctors, nurses, and students from Depauw University. The team will be putting in the Water system and doing village health care.

Internal: Thirty colleagues and House ring in the 80s and celebrate the 70s at New Year's Eve celebration.

Contradiction: Focusing missional planning so that hot leads and good opportunities become clear maneuvers. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Reverend Mother of Mercy High School says "yes" to classroom Town Meeting demonstrations and releases time for CYF participation in February.

Internal: Four from the House and four from the Metro attend Continental Council resulting in vision clarification and new resolve for six month strategies.

Contradiction: Using quantitative training methods that enable local residents to lead quality events. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Munising Partner Conference recruitment takes a turn in depth as local folks get 70 firm commitments to attend the four hour planning conference January 17, 1980.

Internal: A journey through the 60's and 70's gives permission to deal with the 80's is New Year's Eve celebration theme that prepared for a great decade.

Contradiction: Creating single thrust in the midst of many missional routes. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: New Year begins with 20 guests at celebration. A new format is created for agency years planning. Community services department does a Forum.

Internal: Grand new year party picks off new quarter as House goes back into full swing.

Contradiction: Specifying practical maneuvers as opposed to unaccomplished goals. (Wk. 3)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Preparation for great events and regional councils brings about the writing of missional directives for the next six months for Area New York.

Internal: The New Year gets a fine start with the creation of new internal life structures such as team assignments and a collegium rationale to put us on the edge this quarter.

Contradiction: Articulating vision for this region for the next four years out of which next six months get created. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Follow-up with communities and colleagues reveals shift in activity and new openness stirring.

Internal: House celebrates the beginning of the Year of Church as the Purple of Advent reminds us of our roots in the historical church.

Contradiction: Standing before the tactical plan that secures the one victory. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Binghamton Urban Probe weekly community leaders session releases new vision and local commitment for next moves. Metro colleagues struggle with decision to attend council as a serious response to new commitment to metro work.

Internal: House rejoices as Carol Poole receives highest grade in school in PSAT test.

Contradiction: Learning to operate again as a performer House through careful time design and assignment. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Neighbourhood community is alive as friends and colleagues drop in during discontinuity. House attends New Year's party at home of new colleague. Twenty one attend the closing of the 70s party at the House.

Internal: All five House members spend discontinuity at House with fine Christmas celebration and visit to movie *Kramer Versus Kramer*.

Contradiction: Holding tension of all the tasks and ensuring the finishing of them. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Kwanza celebration, the seven days after Christmas celebrates Black Americans in families and communities and is highlight of Ivy City's Christmas celebrations. Week culminates in New Year's Eve and final feast of Kwanza - 50 people help celebrate.

Internal: New decor in collegium is highlight as preparations are made for regional council and the leap into Quarter III and the 80s.

Contradiction: Daring to create the story(s) and symbols of how the programs and assignments are dealing with the perceived contradiction. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: *Gifts for the 80s* pays off as phoning nets \$300, then Santa brings gifts to all kids in Town as part of 12 hour Christmas celebration.

Internal: New Year's Eve party attended by three community residents and the three house members.

Contradiction: Finding the short term wins which maintains momentum for long term maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Methodist Ministerium gathering of 40 ministers and wives is excited by a demonstration Town Meeting and can be plugged into future months of State Campaign.

Internal: Demonstration Community of Tioga-Nicetown prepares for regional council with two meetings to get on top of construct and rehearse leadership roles.

Contradiction: Internalizing the death ground in the state campaign by the whole regional movement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Planning meeting prepares Community Congress format and workshop leaders and raises images of project transition. Six youth are trained for CYF. Collating party gets out Heritage Chapter 4 *Memories of the Good Old Days*.

Internal: Our deep experiences of the last year were shared by skits in a party for Joe Nagy going to Kinney.

Contradiction: Acknowledging the deadline for Cornshop funding and going out to meet it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Participation in New England Guardians Meeting in Boston, Urban Summit in New York, and CYF presentation to Methodist Church in Augusta, Maine scatters House in many directions.

Internal: Old and new colleagues come by to see how they can participate, and work on proposals and advocacy.

Contradiction: Building screens to inform us how effectively to hold the tension among many demands and possibilities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Auxiliary and Charlotte Valley Firewood manger have fine bank appointment. December 31 regional council precedes New Year celebration aboard "Global-Air Flight" from the 70s to 1980.

Internal: Appropriate ecclesiola construct delights the spirit of House members.

Contradiction: Spiritizing quarter calender in response to societal contradictions. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Appointment set up by Guardian Duane Day, opens up possibility of LENS with two government agencies as well as CYFs in nearby community.

Internal: Regional New Year's celebration, first regional event in new Hartford house, is global with Chinese, Vietnamese and claims great promise for the new decade after looking at the significance of the past decade.

Contradiction: Engaging entire House and metro colleagues to build on momentum created by breakloose events of December. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: Six Lorne marketers find six potential buyers with samples to reproduce and prepare quotations. Area Strike Force is mobilized over the weekend to move LEDC into new phase of stable profitability. Kingsbury CFC is highlighted by French regional orchestrators from a local university and institution for mentally retarded.

Internal: Permeator makes leap into \$14,000 job.

Contradiction: Quickly reconfiguring to maintain current momentum on the other side of assigning troops to Area Strike Force. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Initial visits in East York glue direction for Mayor's visit next week as *East York into the 80's* campaign begins to take shape.

Internal: House and colleagues prepare for Regional Council and Christmas celebration that allows everyone to participate on the past quarter victory.

Contradiction: Building concrete images of the next six months of what needs to happen to illuminate the new that will have our doing deeply related to the future. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Ottawa sends representatives to the Canadian ICA Board of Directors meeting in Montreal. OHDP takes 10 leaps forward as House mingles with reeves and mayors across Ontario at the Association of Counties and Regions in Ontario (ACRO).

Internal: Halloween kicks off week of celebrative activities including Paige's birthday party and a fine ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Deciding which lily pad to land on when being pushed off the cliff of decisions on the Ontario HDP. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX—LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Five community persons pay their own way to Area Council in Montreal and return with great story of the event. LEDC with a burst of concentrated effort gets the 1980 LEAP proposal in final form and both boards approve it for presentation.

Internal: Great Area gathering held over New Year's with the Voyage, new songs, campaign bottomlines and celebrative New Decade phone calls.

Contradiction: Sensing where the auxiliary and the community are on the journey in order to see how much we can turn the dial or take the next step. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP**

External: Continental Council ends with year's (1980) battleplan and assignments completed. Area Lima and Area Havana stay over for week of development which nets \$2000 in hand and Blue Buick for drive to Lima. Board of Directors for Cano Negro plan next quarter for the village including Anniversary celebration.

Internal: House celebrates Christmas with Continental guests and all attend Guardian's son's lavish wedding.

Contradiction: Focusing the Area Movement plans to complement the completed continent and project plans. (Wk. 2)

BUENOS AIRES**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP**

External: Over 25 farmers of Sol, meet to discuss the Agriculture Strategy for 1980, elects a representative group of six and articulate their distrust of each other and yet necessity of cooperative action.

Internal: Joaquina Rodriguez graduates from Agricultural School and the House celebrates Talos birthday.

Contradiction: Modifying community organization to keep up with creative changes in the community. (Wk. 1)

RIO DE JANEIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP**

External: The Junior Health Caretakers participate in an excursion to Rio Bonito to visit a dentist and a hospital, which is the first time out of Bananeiras for many of them. Three women are sent to Rio de Janeiro for bakery training with Fleischmann Yeast's baking school. Chemicals are inkinded from EMATER-Rio to nurture sprouting plants. Home gardens numbers 22 and 23 go up, one of them is the demonstration covered garden. Children in the after-school program, dressed in yellow scarves with the program symbol, clean, weed and whitewash rocks for the preschool on Community Day.

Internal: Jim Campbell spends two days in Manaus en route to Caracas as a result of the change in government in Bolivia and subsequent slowdown of Air Bolivia flights.

Contradiction: Refocusing the thrust of the Project for the next six weeks to build on victories that are at hand. (Wk. 8)

HAVANA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP**

External: Incredible construction momentum and enthusiasm erupt as roof of pre-school is completed and work on industrial shed begins.

Internal: Engine falls out of van while carrying site visitor from Royal Bank, leaving House without independent transport.

Contradiction: Finding the methods to use local man's wisdom fully. (Wk. 11)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Christmas and New Year's is great time of miracles as the Development effort reaps harvest: \$7,000 from Canadian Embassy, \$1,000 from Sears, and \$1,475 from other sources. New auxiliary house goes up in three days. Global film is shown twice in San Jose, Costa Rica in preparation for Forum campaign there this quarter. Thirty four member team from DePauw University arrives with thousands of dollars worth of medicines and next morning engages in tremendous workday which provides beehive of ctivity across community and fills villagers with wonder and gratitude.

Internal: Guatemalan oven-builder decides to intern after working with project for two weeks; Guardians Darrell Brown from Oak Park, Ill, and honeymooning Bud and Michelle Philbrook from Minneapolis and Donna Marie Wheeler from Evanston, Ill, all plug into the last minute preparations for DePauw team.

Contradiction: Spreading the miracle and the momentum of the DePauw visit so that it reaches the entire community. (Wk.3)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VICENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: The new primary school is sanded, painted, and blessed. The preschool has its first graduation followed by a visit by the Ministry of Education with an offer to build a pre-school and staff it. Community Assembly is called by the Village Council to discuss the legal structure of the Project.

Internal: Mike Hoff visits to look over the books.

Contradiction: Creating structures to do detailed long term planning. (Wk. 12)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports Band meeting in Brussels was highlighted by reports from each nexus, spirit conversations on the 80s, and the gracious hospitality of Brussels Nexus. Toward the 6.6 million, 1.6 is banked, 1.4 is committed with 3.6 to go. Eight highly focused global maneuvers were created including: Matching the Maryknoll Money, The ITT-2, Facilitating the Ford Foundation, The Global Pharmaceutical Industry, Launching The Hunger Proposal, The Dutch Embassy, The Canadian AID and the US AID. The Centrum is in the midst of three primary image shifts: 1) from development raising money to building a movement, 2) from fund-raising schemes to strategies which achieve stated objectives, and 3) from working proven methods to building new constituencies. The key contradiction lies in the arena of maintaining the balance globally between public and private support while continuing to enlarge program self-support.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports 94 graduates from Bubun HDTI. the Ecclesiola manual impacts all and the Chicago Urban Guild comes up with 32 tactics to care for Chicago. Using the strategy building method which was used in Maliwada is the breakthrough. The key contradiction lies in the arena of getting the Global Band maneuvers for the next six months expressed, written, and interchanged.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports global and continental calenders for Quarter III and IV are built. McDonald's requests ICA to train their working staff. New symbol created in Band meeting makes the doing of the two million human settlements a new and real possibility. The key contradiction lies in the arena of immediate concerns and demands for clarity related to particular missional thrusts block the grasp of comprehensive strategic intent and coordinated focus.

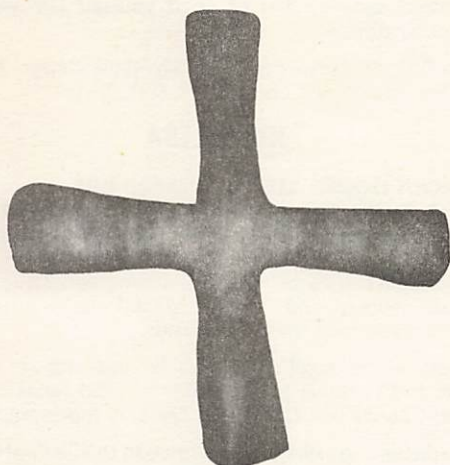
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

External: House joins hands with Manchester to circuit twelve metros in two regions with two teams and gets in place for a mass awakening event "sets" in the next two quarters.

Internal: Area Awakening Campaign PSU. gathers in Glasgow to work out areal strategies and phasing begins with Ecclesiola on Friday night and concludes with House Church on Sunday demonstrates the power of corporate consensus building in releasing creativity.

Contradiction: Seeing bunch of sets instead of a strategic network being built.(Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL—TAI'RGWAITH HDP

External: Bristol region mailed first edition of Community Update, regional newsletter.

Internal: House hosts Linda Vermoy on her way to Kenya and completes Quarter III planning.

Contradiction: Establishing a sense of urgency that creates momentum for events and programs. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Two treks cover 12 metros in a week netting series of events in each of eight metros.

Internal: Evening at the Institute hosts the Bishop.

Contradiction: Building momentum that creates the tension releasing momentum particularly in arena of formation. (Wk.4)

MADRID

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRID

External: Spain's first demonstration Town Meeting held with key leaders in poor mountain village of Navatagordo in the province of Avila. All translated TM materials now completely edited. Extremadura TM set-up scheduled for end of January.

Internal: House picks up 16 hours a week of English teaching and prospective intern lands full time job as insurance salesman.

Contradiction: Rebuilding the momentum of the past Quarter's trips throughout Spain and Portugal. (Wk.4)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House arranges purchase of new circuit car. Bill Parker leads two collegiums on West Africa LENS marketing and strategies.

Internal: Paris House journeys to celebrate New Year's Eve with Brussels House and Nexus.

Contradiction: Preparing the Quarter's training, Development and circuit set-up without grasp of new, winning edge. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Continental Council comes off as a great event, with innovative methods keyed around a Thursday Area Priors Flagstaff and 45 minute Voyage exercises at mealtimes, and leaves, as a residue, an emerging image of expanded Centrum roles and tasks for the future.

External: Italian Roman Catholic order of school teachers agree to set up three TM sets in two regions for Quarter III.

Internal: Rome House celebrates Christmas with Fr. Fernando Abalos as guest. Discontinuity begins and ends with exploratory excursions into Rome.

Contradiction: Turning the practical vision into imaginative tactics that will use time and troops to the best advantage. (Wk. 4)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS—IJEDE HDP**

External: GWF held in Uyo, Cross River State with 100 practical, determined women. New signboards, including those for proposed toilet sites, are painted. House hosts three day site visit of two people from Ugborodo village in Escarros, in preperation for Doop project.

Internal: House celebrates 25th birthdays of Owolola Olatunji and Charles Jago three days apart.

Contradiction: Setting the structures which will carry all activites through the middle of January. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DOUALA

External: Visit with French Ministry of Cooperation opens new avenues for their support in Francophone Africa. Guardian, Gerald Nani, does week of framing calls and gets out his calendar to look at possibility of going on West Africa framing trip in January.

Internal: Fast is followed by very early morning feast, which enables new self-consciousness of the dynamics of the feast.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of one thrust when in two locations. (Wk. 11)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Evening at the Institute is held at House with 17 colleagues and new acquaintances in attendance to hear report on Kenya with slides given by Johannes Bruckner and Harry Jansen. Colleagues help with enablement and tour House during show. Two registrations for Christmas trek follow within two days.

Internal: House discovers the power of the facility in telling the movement story.

Contradiction: Taking time to pull together and train self-conscious movement so that limited resources expand to fill the program opportunities available. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Senate gives DM 26,000 for after school program operations and Andus Electronic Company decides to invest DM 2,000. to community Limited Liability Company. Lutheran Local Church pastors wants to join House Meetings while preparation for quarterly planning is going on.

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—KAPINI HDP**

Internal: A fine, intrusion free collegium room is discovered in the midst of a building we thought had none.

Contradiction: Enabling village and staff to share the same vision relative to the next six months of extension. (Wk. 4)

NAIROBI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: Continental Council focuses on replication in Africa with many of the recommendations pointed in that direction. Fantastic New Year's Eve celebration with fine food, skits illustrating life in the village projects and the continent, and dancing followed by claims of promise for the future. Dispersion of troops to set first consult; first phase of three new projects. HDTI team begins prep for third HDTI as one-half of HDTI faculty do consult in Ulutya.

Internal: With dispersion of troops, those of us who remain can once again fit into collegium room for corporate meals and planning. Roy Stansbury sent out to Brussels for Global Development Band Meeting

Contradiction: Adjusting structurally to rapid demands of replication. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAMWELENI—KAMWELENI HDP

External: Marcell's community Health Caretaker from Stake 4, registers 150 mothers on clinic day. Generator and water pump houses completion gives security to community properties. Construction Industry secures contract for 60 water jars at 60,000 Kenya Shillings in Ngelani village.

Internal: House sends out Francis Nguku for saturation in Northern and Eastern Divisions of Machakos and Augustine Hajega to HDTI in Kawangware.

Contradiction: Enabling major tasks before rains in midst of farmer's preparation at farms and troop assignments to saturation site selection and HDTI faculty. (Wk. 6)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY—MALIWADA HDP

External: Representatives from each division meet with Global Methods School to plan Actuation Module for closing week of GMS when district team counterparts come to Maliwada to build maneuvers for each district till end of quarter. Women in GMS meet with area to plan women's advancement actuation module.

Internal: Participating in *Ancient of Days* conversation during Actuation module in GMS gives new myths to stand before in ongoing process of Nava Gram Prayas.

Contradiction: How to publish new song book before Council. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS

External: 35-CCA Status of I.C.A.: INDIA was renewed marking a great victory for this quarter. 1979 ended with raising and depositing of Rs. 90,000 on the last day. Nexus participated in Continental Council, Area Bombay Council and the Global Research Band Meeting, all held at Maliwada and are great spiritizing events for the villagers, auxiliary and global colleagues.

Internal: House sends out H.S. Gavai, Stan Gibson and Vaughan O'Halloran to Brussels for Global Development Band Meeting, Brian Robins and Dierdre Dowsett to Chicago for Global Operations Band Meeting, and Vinod Parekh to Latin America on Panchayat Trek.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on our advantages and disadvantages to move into this new quarter with strength. (Wk.)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI—SIKROR HDP

External: White washing temple catalyzes 200 strong village meeting. Successful health camp and first 'spontaneous' village workday.

Internal: House receives inkind blankets, medicine and clothes for winter colds and flu and is released to new engagement.

Contradiction: Ensuring project momentum is maintained through end of quarter discontinuity and Continental Council. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MADRAS—NADLAPUR HDP

External: Foundations for 30 new houses completed. The house design made by the villagers themselves is adapted by neighboring towns. A ten point plan for completion of the project is submitted on invitation of the district collector.

Internal: Auxiliary gets its teeth into intensive Gram Sabha pedagogy.

Contradiction: Decision making and training structures become static. (Wk. 1)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: House publishes a report of the Quarter II awakening victory in the form of a brochure to be used during Quarter III's site selection work.

Internal: Luncheon with a potential intern referred by an agency colleague initiates House's search for Bengali staff.

Contradiction: Deciding the parameters of the Awakening Campaign so that site selection happens. (Wk. 2)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Bubun and Sungai Lui guests visit for discontinuity. Mail out 100 invitations for January Guardians event and began receiving "yes" response.

Internal: House disperses to mountains and beaches for discontinuity.

Contradiction: Moving confidently into Quarter III without having done Nexus planning. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE—SERUSUP HDP

External: Toyota truck is presented officially to village by Deputy Chief Minister and receives front page coverage with photo. Village decides to hire one overall manager for all three economic ventures. DOOP model is used with village leaders.

Internal: Four staff are assigned to Bubun HDTs and village clusters in Indonesia.

Contradiction: Trusting the village to keep the economic ventures running through the village company structure. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR—SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Date set for Village Assembly and consensus on village company made by leadership core. Teachers training and English classes continue each week during School vacation. M\$ 2,500 raised by development.

Internal: Kathy Reese and Tom visit from HDTs in Bubun while getting visas renewed. Judy begins her job at Kentucky Fried Chicken.

Contradiction: Appropriating the nonchalance of the village while ensuring that all that is necessary happens. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Key leader of Ministry of Home Affairs helps ICA to strengthen national and provincial frames. Nurada kicks off construction of community center with 50-person Gotong Royong workday. Land deal is negotiated by villagers and government.

Internal: A. Paul's baby girl arrives three weeks early, just 12 hours after Antony arrives on the scene from Bubun.

Contradiction: Realizing government decision in December to enable extension in September, 1980, while at the same time intensifying the demonstration so that every local government office will beg for extension. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEDAN—BUBUN HDP

External: Fourth DOOP, the Human Development Module, with focus on living environment brings out master plan design for Bubun. Ur image impact is great with releasing celebration Saturday night with food, singing, and dancing from the six urs. Provincial head of rural development speaks to HDTs participants about Governor's seven prognoses for village development and challenges Bubun to leap rest of way from undeveloped to developed village.

Internal: Kaz study in HDTs gives images to the "cry" struggle to articulate in familiar Islamic terms.

Contradiction: Creating the mythology to sustain the movement which is forming before our eyes. (Wk. 13)

Contradiction: Intensifying the tension of holding global commonality while honoring local advantages. (Wk. 3)

Internal: House sends out Linda Yang to Taipei to help with development and celebrates a great week with an adventurous trek to the mountains.

Contradiction: Finding the Chinese *Those Who Care* to release the next quarter's victories. (Wk 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: It is a week of inkind victories with Toyota Jeepney for Mactan delivered to boat and with Rancie cloth for teachers' uniforms for 20 new Mactan preschools. There are also breakthroughs with companies including two inquiries about doing projects cooperatively around company plantations, endorsement by Japanese Chamber of Commerce and LENS seminar set for January with San Miguel Corporation.

Internal: House is visited by two Oyubari residents returning from Sudtonggan trip.

Contradiction: Focusing all programs into one national thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development for first two weeks of the year brings in US \$1,583. Cabinet-level government minister phones ICA office to express his appreciation for success of the Hai Ou Project after visiting the village on New Year's Day.

Internal: HK development staff visit Hai Ou. Peter Hu returns from Chicago Academy, three staff arrive for LENS marketing and Week II LENS with Kaohsiung Monomer Co.

Contradiction: Expanding current human development training phase from demonstration programs to geographically spread development movement. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU—SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Second week of Mactan Consults finished, creating atmosphere of circus about the whole island as 16 villages swirl workdays, proposals, new T-shirts, amplified night meetings, lining up to request trucks at the City Engineer's office. Teams, gunned by blue shirts, weigh over 1,300 children ages 0 to 6 years old and classify 1,020 as malnourished, 74 as immediate hospital cases. Mid-consult report to city staggers officials.

Contradiction: Doing corporate reflection and reading road signs from four vehicles going 90 miles/hour. (Wk. 4)

Internal: Welcome Dick Sims for Development Trek, Yodobulo Estorgio, and D. Gomez from HDTs staff begin planning for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Accelerating the five cluster HDP's. (Wk. 3)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Guardian Paul Murayama travels to Hong Kong for the SEAPAC Council; Saitama Prefecture calls to initiate arrangements for 1980 Town Meetings.

Internal: New Year's holiday is highlighted by a great National Council in Osaka which plots the next major leap as Town Meeting; Japan enters its second year.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the national frame to assure impact saturation and demonstration initiation in the 12 stronghold prefectures. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU—KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Experimental series of declaration missions is completed with twelfth in Sang Yang Ri.

Internal: Passage film impacts House members.

Contradiction: Maintaining rhythm while dancing so close to the edge. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Visit with key bank colleague lays track for Quarter III development and housing issues. Clergy visits produce several hundred dollars and February PLC.

Contradiction: Getting all systems in go position for Quarter III. (Wk. 1)

Internal: Mr. Park is sent out to SEAPAC meeting and Sampa ITI.

Contradiction: Making best use of school holidays. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: House continues development and raises \$250. Nagasaki's 18 impact events are confirmed. A volunteer continues setting up development calls. January 12 receives boost with 75 people at Year End Party at ICA.

Contradiction: Reviving contacts for Quarter III saturation in the Lower Murray in midst of engagement in Area Council. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Regional colleagues, Phil Arkins and Paul Grundy and House meet with Portland, Vic. councilman to plan forums for coming year. Good visit with Guardians John and Lisa Little, who have returned to Australia after five years in Montreal area.

Internal: Sojourners and waysiders fill House with celebrations.

Contradiction: Participating in area training and council event in Sydney while in Melbourne. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA — MURRIN BRIDGE HDP

External: Community Care Program launched with four part-time workers, two auxiliaries and two community people. Best zucchini sales yet. Six people travel to the Aboriginal Task Force as part of the Sydney Area annual program.

Contradiction: Creating forward movement while school holiday syndrome diffuses entire community. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Christmas mailing prepared for grassroots year end contributions. Calendars for next quarter enliven office space. House assumes responsibility for Summer Youth Program. CYF set-up for January.

Internal: House celebrates birthday and arrival of Christmas tree. Garden planted with vegetables galore.

Contradiction: Operating out of a winning model now that year's plan has new values and is out of focus. (Wk. 1)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO—MARSHALLS HDP**

External: Severe tidal wave destroys much of Majuro (D-U-D area) including the Majuro House. President Carter declares Majuro a US federal disaster area. ICA and TASC staff become the supply liaison and hold three orientation sessions for the 30 American Red Cross volunteers and staff flown in. Sales at TASC continue to the few customers still in business and increase to Red Cross and US Army who set up three tent cities and feed 10,000 daily.

Internal: Baileys return for Regional Council glad to have a room instead of a tent, and ongoing House structures offer an island of normalcy in a sea of chaos.

Contradiction: Transforming the disaster wave into a creative wave that allows the refinancing of TASC. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA—SALANI HDP

External: Savair Loto, 1974 ITI grad, witnesses to the ITI as training for replication in the Pacific and 10 Salani villagers sign up.

Internal: The fishing boat supplies food for the House in addition to an economic victory for the village.

Contradiction: Quickly capitalizing an interest in the ITI to move six people to decide to staff 3 new area Suva Houses in August. (Wk. 2)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Three metro circuits with two people teams each leave the House Monday morning and return Friday evening with events scheduled and the power of the film and symposium call format demonstrated.

Internal: Office rearrangement and publication of the back up material for the Quarter's maneuvers symbolize the leap into the 80's.

Contradiction: Articulating the cost of everyone participating in the newly charted directions to reach the missional goals. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE—RICHGROVE HDP

External: Youth programs encompassing first graders through high school age are all initiated. Richgrove Kitchen produces first profit checks for investors.

Internal: Fernando Campos arrives from Guatemala and his welcome is aided by four colleagues in Richgrove who speak to him in Spanish.

Contradiction: Objectifying and timelining Quarter tactics to release winning expenditure. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Subaru is finest of taxis as we battle six inches of snow which halts road traffic through the mountains, re-routes air traffic to Portland and San Francisco and strands hundreds of motorists. All of LENS team finally arrives a day late, and Rainier Bank phones their people to be sure all brave snow to attend.

Internal: Snowfall closes schools and enables youths' full participation in roundtable and Thursday night as we continue to put form on the quarter maneuvers.

Contradiction: Initiating task teams to cover all bases of quarter operations. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Claiming promises for the 80's at New Year's Eve celebration sets the vision for next six months and preparation for regional meeting concretizes the vision.

Internal: House families get together for Christmas and New Year celebrations and week intensive planning for next quarter evokes fear and fascination of the scope of missional engagement.

Contradiction: Securing good attendance at regional meeting which is key to colleague engagement in metro impact events. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: House kicks off the New Mexico 76-Town Meeting Campaign in Portales with 15 participants and four colleagues receiving training. TM followup phoning uncovers two more Arizona signal communities brings the total to seven. House completes four-year planning and defines nine major maneuver arenas for the next six months.

Internal: House holds our first mobile Ecclesiola with five colleagues in Clovis, New Mexico. Kelly Michael's 17th birthday party is a highlight for the House as we celebrate with cake and lasagna.

Contradiction: Internalizing the urgency with sufficient death grounds. (Wk. 4)

External: State Library program administrated by local VISTA volunteers donates \$1500 worth of educational supplies.

Internal: Three college women arrive for one month sojourn from Scranton, Pennsylvania.

Contradiction: Maximizing effectiveness of short term visitors in special projects. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Quarter calendar gets firmed up with phone calls across the area, as weather outside drops to below 0 degrees Fahrenheit for most of the week then jumps from -2 degrees to 52 degrees in 12 hours as the first "chinook" (a warm winter wind) of the year blows through.

Internal: Two nights of celebration highlight the week: our first Ecclesiola is thoroughly enjoyed by all, and on Friday night, the entire House participates in celebrating Roy Francis Philbrook's 5th birthday.

Contradiction: Finding selves in crunch of completing models and beginning implementaries without neglecting either. (Wk. 4)

Contradiction: Gaining momentum on economic ventures when Jack Frost freezes everyone (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: First week of bi-regional circuiting focuses on Edmonton Region. Saskatoon and Edmonton joint newsletter printed and mailed out. Week 3 Development Circuit set up by regional guardian

Internal: Ian Woodbury returns bringing "cast" with him. Decor made for Quarter and Week 3 campaign

Contradiction: Weaving together development and circuit preparation so we can take maximum advantage of advance work done for Week 3. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG—VOGAR HDP

External: Vogar Products Ltd. moves building to a new location. All arrangements handled by the women without assistance from ICA consultants

Contradiction: Enabling engagement and responsibility of colleagues toward campaign initiation and HDP documentation. (Wk. 4)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Twenty-nine folks from four of the six regions of Area Houston participate in the Voyage. Computer prints 825 Regional newsletter labels. Teams explore six urban demonstration community prospects selected by Chamber of Commerce. Trull Foundation says "yes" to \$5K for Town Meeting.

Internal: Thirty-two feast on 37 pounds of turkey, 11 pies and more for Thanksgiving dinner

Contradiction: Naming the victory that history needs from the Houston Region before January 1 in the face of uncertainty about how to break loose a forum schedule while society's mindset turns more and more toward Christmas and the holidays. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO—INDIAHOMA HDP

External: The Indianoma Festival of Homes Towns is announced by the Mayor and Community Development Corporation for May 23-26, 1980, with 40 local citizens and others from Medicine Park, Lawton, Oklahoma City and Dallas meeting to plan the activities. PR and coordination of the Festival. Indianoma hosts the Dallas Regional Council; Comanche Tribe grants \$3,000 for local grocery store; New Year's Eve celebration is held at community center; 200 citizens meet to discuss proposed lake which would take their farmlands; Mayor sees Senator Terrill; documentation done in OK on Central City Five where the Comptons have worked for six years; membership campaign is launched for the Indianoma CDC; Home Savings and Loan approves full loan for local match for mini-mall while campaign is launched to raise local money (the 200 Club)

Internal: House welcomes Claudia Cramer for festival planning with community, Regional Council and collegial celebration.

Contradiction: Fostering fear of risking in the community's future by foggy data concerning major projects.. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO—ASHERTON HDP

External: Stake visits and meetings elicit practical vision and new songs with 175 participating. Pivotal planning session for the next six months takes community's vision, holds it over against contradictions and comes out with 27 key and exciting proposals. Community Assembly fleshes out activities.

Internal: Rivas family arrives from Guatemala! House and community are impacted by presence of powerful Spanish-speaking ICA staff

Contradiction: finishing planning to the releasing details while "doing" at the same time. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: New strategy in Arkansas releases maneuver to initiate clusters, and first three towns contacted request second Town Meetings.

Internal: Celebration on Bourbon Street in New Orleans after exciting Sector Meeting is key to refreshing troops for re-engagement.

Contradiction: Creating visibility in midst of skeptical reception. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: In the first week of RS-I set-up; House contacts 15 churches and mails 80 invitations, 18 colleagues gather around the table for Friday Ecclesiola.

Internal: A Day II construct provides spirit care and energy as the ICA office gets a fresh coat of paint and painters stay up 'til wee hours of Saturday to finish a *Profound Humanness* montage. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA—DELTA PACE HDP

External: Planning meeting in Leakesville hears witnesses about what their TM did: Saved 300 jobs, elected new officials, parks, buildings, Delta Pace preschool, the only one in Bolivar County, builds plan to continue funding through next year with teachers calling forth what they learned at 5th City preschool about development

Internal: A team in Pace, a team in Southern and a team in Golden Triangle with coordination from Jackson is the picture of scatteredness for January.

Contradiction: Removing the sense of paralysis over the complexity of the largest TM month to date with the pressing authorization tasks in Jackson and the set-up of the Pace extension. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Preliminary meeting in Calliope Urban Housing Development to set up cluster of 10 forums brings receptive response from this self managing development of 1500 units.

Internal: Eloise Patton is welcomed back from Academy. House experiences discontinuity and hosts Clements and Ennis family.

Contradiction: Redirecting celebrative spirit of discontinuity to missional engagement. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: *Top Ten* leads to network for doing maneuvers on Tennessee are named after completion of framing workshop.

Internal: House Day Care Center reaches full enrollment of four infants to meet self-support budget.

Contradiction: Creating visibility in midst of skeptical reception. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: New Year's retreat, sponsored by Guardians with 32 around the table, reflects on 70s and visions 80s. Following weekend regional council is held as gears are set in motion for March Gibson HDTs.

Internal: New ecclesiola launches quarter. Major inkind victories for regional council include 400 apple and sweet potato pies.

Contradiction: Getting critical mass going in several strategic arenas so quarter won't be dribbled. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE—GIBSON HDP

External: Community moves in all Guild arenas as Town Council says "yes" to HUD Rural Initiations program, visit to E.L.C. Certification Office. Twelve youth at Guild meeting and one house member assists Miami House in Tallahassee Metro Donor Circuits and raises \$5018 which is two and a half times the bottom line.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with everyone cooking one dish creates corporate celebration in midst of having five of 12 House members on the road.

Contradiction: Assuming, rather than thorough planning leaves House with no immediately viable site for ELC relocation and one week behind schedule. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: The Global film showing before 82 members of Church Women United brings requests to see the film in four new locations. Practical details for Consumer Conference Town Meetings with developmentally disabled are worked out in a

Miami Conference with state agency people. Quarter Planning targets three geographic areas in District 6. Christmas phoning raises \$500.

Internal: Self support is dealt with in House blitz for jobs in January; David begins new job.

Contradiction: Solidifying our six months vision in such a way that practices get sorted out from tasks so momentum needed to do 100 events is generated. (Wk. 3)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: House begins planning for continental council with corporate brooding. Management receives payback on TASC loan which enables sending out full program checks for past two months. Blue Skies Maneuver report excites all.

Internal: Abundant Thanksgiving celebration is held with Academy joining House and guests.

Contradiction: Enforcing corporate discipline and a new decision to produce. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: The 5th City Business Careers (FCBC) contract is signed, sealed and delivered. To symbolize the event the FCBC sign is erected in front of the Industrial Center. Back debt from Chicago House of \$200,000 is waved by Brethern.

Contradiction: Orchestrating special maneuver teams with the ongoing task. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA—LORIMOR HDP

External: Community residents join task forces for inkinding, practics and recruitment as prep for the HDTs is initiated. Community Oil Col decides to secure funding and pledges of business to build new gas station.

Internal: Weekly core meeting with community uses the roundtable dynamic of conversation, study and workshop with Lorimorians doing all roles.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary recruitment for the HDTs that gives us a new advantage after the school is over. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Bruce Lanphear attends CYF in Indianapolis, visits to KCMO and KCK city governments open possibilities for CYFs and LENS in city. Regional Council in Lorimor makes concrete plans for HDTs in Lorimor and the Iowa Campaign.

Internal: Dallas Ziegenhorn attends dental seminar, Russell Wheellock goes to vocational education meeting in California and Donna Ziegenhorn opens a new House Box Service in Oklahoma with hot-air balloon ride.

Contradiction: Securing 1980 funding from willing corporations that are now making budget decisions while still not having a thought-through financial story for the Lorimor HDTs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Tri-sectoral LENS (public, private, voluntary) is held January 12 in Newfolden in the midst of a snowstorm with 37 participants representing a cross section of the leadership of Marshall County, mayors, county officials, RDC representatives, farmers, bankers and senior citizens groups.

Internal: Randy Kmrzik and Pam Ruff, St. John's College students, begin their three-week sojourn as preschooler Jaffer Batica spends his first week at Montessori.

Contradiction: Aligning with sponsors without losing campaign ground. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Part time jobs search to involve all in both self-support and program yields printing apprenticeship for Nathan Jewell, many other concrete options and participation of old colleagues in child care for Bridget. Cindy Booher finds newest House addition, Mactan, the dog.

Internal: Meeting with East St. Louis Aldermanic Committee elicits decision to form funding committee. Battleplanning session at metro colleague's home and mailings put us in position for solid attendance at week 4 organizational meeting.

Contradiction: Finding and starting part-time jobs to eliminate self-support worry and release an inclusive time design. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA—MILL SHOALS HDP

External: Local Development Corporation holds election of officers and adopts bylaws.

Internal: Advent begins with visit from Santa to House and Mini Park.

Contradiction: Delivering methods training while honoring existing structures. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY-KINNEY HDP

External: Barb Bellamy drives 6½ hours in a blizzard to help orchestrate a LENS course in Newfolden, MN, with 37 participants, the first event for the Marshall County Demonstration Pilot. Internal: Proving that weather isn't a

contradiction, House members go in different directions for meetings in hazardous weather.

Contradiction: Taking the path of least resistance rather than the comprehensive. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: The House conducts Quarter III and IV battleplanning of vision, contradictions, proposals, and tactical arenas as input for a Week 2 battleplanning workshop with local colleagues.

Internal: The House welcomes 20 persons from the Chicago Area House for a joyous celebration of the first New Years Eve of the 80s held at the home of local colleagues.

Contradiction: Realizing in the midst of great joyousness, that performance of missional task is ever more exciting and fulfilling than discontinuity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: As a result of recontact blitz in November, Town of Colfax and Lafayette cadres pull off an evening TM Assembly which draws 48 delegates from seven towns, all within an hour of Colfax. The Lorimer slides and their own victory stories are the heart of a very successful event. Two signal communities are identified and new colleagues show their support of ICA programs.

Internal: Sending out Jailu Vergara to one month intensive preparation for State Nursing Exam and Emerito Nicer ends sojourn

Internal: A journey through the 60's and 70's gives permission to deal with the 80's is New Year's Eve celebration theme that prepared for a great decade.

Contradiction: Creating single thrust in the midst of many missional routes. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Twenty-five attend ecclesiola and hear a special report from a signal community.

Internal: Seven letters and seven phone calls result in 11 cases of paper inked.

Contradiction: Orchestrating the leap to specific signals. (Wk. 4)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Preparation for great events and regional councils brings about the writing of missional directives for the next six months for Area New York.

Internal: The New Year gets a fine start with the creation of new internal life structures such as team assignments and a collegium rationale to put us on the edge this quarter.

Contradiction: Articulating vision for this region for the next four years out of which next six months get created. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Follow-up with communities and colleagues reveals shift in activity and new openness stirring.

Internal: House celebrates the beginning of the Year of Church as the Purple of Advent reminds us of our roots in the historical church.

Contradiction: Standing before the tactical plan that secures the one victory. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Rochester Metro completes plan to visit neighborhood leaders in Rochester as part of Urban Research/Contexting Blitz. HDTs brochure delivered to printer for Week II mailing.

Internal: Jan Ulanga initiates new guest room, here as part of Binghamton-Rochester Urban Research Team.

Contradiction: Expanding region of colleague base for participation in Urban Research front. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Neighbourhood community is alive as friends and colleagues drop in during discontinuity. House attends New Year's party at home of new colleague. Twenty one attend the closing of the 70s party at the House.

Internal: All five House members spend discontinuity at House with fine Christmas celebration and visit to movie *Kramer Versus Kramer*.

Contradiction: Holding tension of all the tasks and ensuring the finishing of them. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON, D.C.—IVY CITY HDP

External: Kwanza celebration, the seven days after Christmas celebrates Black Americans in families and communities and is highlight of Ivy City's Christmas celebrations. Week culminates in New Year's Eve and final feast of Kwanza - 50 people help celebrate.

Internal: New decor in collegium is highlight as preparations are made for regional council and the leap into Quarter III and the 80s.

Contradiction: Daring to create the story(s) and symbols of how the programs and assignments are dealing with the perceived contradiction. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE—WIDEN HDP

External: Gifts for the 80's pays off as phoning nets \$300, then Santa brings gifts to all kids in town as part of 12 hour Christmas celebration.

Internal: New Year's Eve party attended by three community residents and the three house members.

Contradiction: Finding the short term wins which maintain momentum for long term maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Methodist Ministerium gathering of 40 ministers and wives is excited by a demonstration Town Meeting and can be plugged into future months of State Campaign.

Internal: Demonstration Community of Tioga-Nicotown prepares for Regional Council with two meetings to get on top of construct and rehearse leadership roles.

Contradiction: Internalizing the death ground in the state campaign by the whole regional movement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN—STARKS HDP

External: Planning meeting prepares Community Congress format and workshop leaders and raises images of project transition. Six youth are trained for CYF. Collating party gets out Heritage Chapter 4 Memories of the Good Old Days.

Internal: Our deep experiences of the last year were shared by skits in a party for Joe Nagy going to Kinney.

Contradiction: Acknowledging the deadline for Cornshop funding and going out to meet it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Participation in New England Guardian Meeting in Boston, Urban Summit in New York, and CYF presentation to Methodist Church in Augusta, Maine, scatters House in many directions.

Internal: Old and new colleagues come by to see how they can participate, and work on proposals and advocacy.

Contradiction: Building screens to inform us how effectively to hold the tension among many demands and possibilities. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY-CHARLOTTEVILLE HDP

External: Regional calendar printed and ready to mail to regional colleagues declares decisions for Quarter III.

Internal: Collegium study of Islam paper is helpful to understanding of current Mideast news events.

Contradiction: Supporting CVF contradiction with corporate vision. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Appointment set up by Guardian Duane Day, opens up possibility of LENS with two government agencies as well as CYF's in nearby community.

Internal: Regional New Year's celebration, first regional event in new Hartford House, is global with Chinese, Vietnamese and claims great promise for the new decade after looking at the significance of the past decade.

Contradiction: Engaging entire House and metro colleagues to build on momentum created by breakloose events of December. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Task force prepares for February meeting of Canadian Guardians in Toronto. Quarter II maneuvers are created with theme of the winter olympics and title of "Going for Gold".

Internal: In the midst of a plethora of inkind food, Montreal House participates in Global Fast on Thursday followed by a breakfast feast.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum in the midst of the uncertainty about where the breakopen will come from. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Proposal for East York Urban Probe Cluster presented to Director of Recreation. Contradiction: Sensing where the auxillary and the community are on the journey in order to see how much we can turn the dial or take the next step. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS—CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Quarter III battleplan maneuvers disclose intensified focus on development, colleague training and convergence of projects and forums.

Internal: Elisa Pacini arrives from Mount Holyoke College to study local government and work in the project for three weeks.

Contradiction: Ensuring spirit journey and care for sojourners while all plates are spinning. (Wk. 4)

BUENOS AIRES

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SANTIAGO—SOL DE SEPTIEMBRE HDP

External: Over 25 farmers of Sol, meet to discuss the Agriculture Strategy for 1980, elect a representative group of six and articulate their distrust of each other and yet necessity of cooperative action.

Internal: Joaquina Rodriguez graduates from Agricultural School and the House celebrates Talos birthday.

Contradiction: Modifying community organization to keep up with creative changes in the community. (Wk 4).

RIO DE JANEIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RIO DE JANEIRO—BANANEIRAS HDP

External: The Junior Health Caretakers participate in an excursion to Rio Bonito to visit a dentist and a hospital, which is the first time out of Bananeiras for many of them. Three women are sent to Rio de Janeiro for bakery training with Fleischmann Yeast's baking school. Chemicals are in-kind from EMATER-Rio to nurture sprouting plants. Home gardens numbers 22 and 23 go up, one of them is the demonstration covered garden. The after-school program, dressed in yellow scarves with the program symbol, cleans, weeds and whitewashes rocks for the preschool on Community Day.

Internal: Jim Campbell spends two days in Manaus en route to Caracas as a result of the change in government in Bolivia and subsequent slowdown of Air Bolivia flights.

Contradiction: Refocusing the thrust of the Project for the next six weeks to build on victories that are at hand. (Wk. 8)

HAVANA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KINGSTON—WOBURN LAWN HDP

External: Incredible construction momentum and enthusiasm erupt as rood of pre-school is completed and work on industrial shed begins.

Internal: Engine falls out of van while carrying site visitor from Royal Bank, leaving House without independant transport.

Contradiction: Finding the methods to use local man's wisdom fully. (Wk. 11)

MEXICO CITY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GUATEMALA CITY—CONACASTE HDP

External: Phenomenal week of sustained engagement as more than 50 villagers work side-by-side with DePauw team in preparing for drinking water system; the deposit is nearly completed and an inkinded bulldozer creates road up the mountain; 300 people seen by doctor and nurses, another 300 see dentist--averaging 2 teeth extractions each. Larry Buchholz and Jeff Parker from Minneapolis spend four days augmenting the team effort of this week's engagement; Consuelo de Leon spends week in Conacaste and translates for DePauw health team.

Internal: Week II planning and House Church serve as time of reflection and celebration of great week of participation and creation of visible signs throughout the community.

Contradiction: Sustaining the engagement of the villagers in all the programs once the present special forces leave. (Wk. 4)

LIMA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LIMA—SAN VINCENTE DE AZPITIA HDP

External: Visit by the Ministry of Education National Planning Institute and UNDP offers the village a new preschool complete with furniture, teachers and salaries. Friday night Secretariat Meeting reveals strength of village leaders.

Internal: Saturday night Thanksgiving dinner becomes a sendout party for the Castros.

ascontradiction: Containing the explosions that are happening simultaneously in the Project, Development and the Movement. (Wk. 11)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports that Charles Lingo returns from Jamaica to show an unintensified awareness of the 3rd World and Human Development, plus great stories of Andrew Young's visit to Woburn Lawn. Development Flagstaff allows for an indepth look at how the Centrum can creatively respond to the new reality we find ourselves in. The contradiction is closing the month with 222 in the midst of creating new configurations and operational patterns.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports New planning methods developed at the Research Band Meeting proof to be a quick, effective tool in preparing the Religious Frame Strategy and reconfiguring for Quarters 3 and 4. A signal GWF in Chicago gives focus to the Urban Lab and breaks open contacts with Community college faculties Chicago and Brussels combine efforts on Urban strategy and movement formation. New and increasing demands upon the Nexuses call for creative cross-centrum configurations even as the demand to articulate Profound Humanness actualizes the Research Net through sodalities. The contradiction is continuing the momentum effectively so that a quarter's work is accomplished in two months.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports global and continental calenders for Quarter III and IV are built. McDonald's requests ICA to train their working staff. New symbol created in Band meeting makes the doing of the two million human settlements a new and real possibility. The key contradiction lies in the arena of immediate concerns and demands for clarity related to particular missional thrusts block the grasp of comprehensive strategic intent and coordinated focus.

GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Global Management Centrum reports that Bombay Nexus disbursed money to all projects and Areas. Brussels Quarter III Management trek to all Houses is launched with trip to Cairo. Chicago Nexus Management Centrum completes Quarter III planning and initiates keystone strategy "Band Meeting", as whole centrum participates in Week II Spacial Facial Maneuver. Brussels reports that monitoring national accounts and moving money enables 130% Programme check distribution and repaying old debt to Order. Band Meetings "leaps" confirm necessity to document policies and procedures for global dissemination and implementation. The contradicton is holding the tension between saying (documentation) what we do and doing what we say (propose) while concretizing the methods and procedures in the midst of new possibilites.
